McLaren told Th

Plymouth Mail & Observer earlier this week that if the township is going to be forced into a binding election on consolidation, a unification study should be undertaken first.

He said the most probable catalyst for such a study would be the Sept. 4 election's advisory question.

Yockey, in speaking to that election, said, "I would urge township residents to vote 'yes' for the purposes of further study."

McKeon said he agreed a study is needed, although one was made several years ago. Yockey and McKeon also

"One of the greatest needs is community-wide police protection."

The mayor said "both the city and township would be better off" under consoli-

There is nothing sacred about any of the city officials or the existing city form of government," McKeon said, but added that he personally favored the city manager form of government.

"Regardless of how the communities are unified, it will not be a take-over by one of the governments," the mayor concluded.



Beginning this October first, all of us in Michigan -- and all who visit our state -- will experience the most revolutionary change in the auto insurance system which yet has been made anywhere in the nation.

October first is the effective date of the no-fault auto insurance law which the Michigan Legislature adopted late in 1972.

The year of lead-time was allowed for legal review and interpretation of the law, and for the rather complicated process of converting the insurance mechanism to the new legal requirements.

Recently, the State Supreme Court has held that the legislative procedures involved in the legislative procedures involved in the legislative constitutional. It has left any other constitutional issues for resolution in individual cases if they should develop. Meanwhile, the process of insurance implementation has reached its final stages.

These lengthy preparations reflect the extent of the no-fault law's impact on the present system.

THE FUNDAMENTAL PURPOSE of the new law is to almost completely reverse the legal concept which has governed auto accident loss compensation -- and consequently the nature of auto insurance -- since the automobile was invented. ance -- s invented.

Invented.

It does this through three basic areas of change.

First, the predominant source of auto injury loss compensation will become an extremely broadened form of the present auto insurance medical and disability coverages.

These coverages now are a relatively minor part of the auto insurance policy because of the dominant role of the liability law principle in auto accidents.

This coverage, called Personal Protection Insurance, will pay two stypes of benefits, promptly and automatically, without regard for who is at fault for an injury.

One of these benefits is all reasonable medical and hospital expenses resulting from an auto accident, in unlimited amount, and for life if necessary, plus the costs of both physical and occupational rehabilitation, if needed.

The other part of the no-fault Personal Protection benefits is a maximum of \$36,000 for income loss, and for replacement of essential services if necessary, for an injured person who is disabled and cannot work -- or for the dependents of one who dies from an auto accident.

THE SECOND BASIC CHANGE

which the new law makes is to severely restrict use of the tort liability law -- the fault system -- for recovery or accident loss from another driver.

It prohibits fault recovery of any economic loss except that which exceeds the no-fault benefits. Since the no-fault hospital-medical benefits are unlimited, this applies only to loss in excess of the benefits for income loss, services replacement, or dependents.

This part also prohibits fault recovery, for, jutangible, loss, com: ery of accident loss from driver.

The other part of the restriction on use of the fault system extends the no-fault concept to property damage, and again it does so in two ways.

Beginning October first, no one will be allowed to drive without insurance by paying \$45 into the state's Motor Vehicle Accident Claims Fund. That fund will be phased out as it pays pending claims.

Every owner of a motor vehicle registered in Michigan, whether it is a car, truck, bus, or trailer -- but not two-wheeled motorcycles, must have the insurance coverages required by the new law.

The law also recognizes, however, that compelling all motorists to insure has not yet been successful anywhere under any system.

It therefore creates an Assigned Claims Plan, which will pay benefits to those injured by uninsured motorists. Essentially these will be accident victims who do not own cars, since insured motorists would be covered under their own policies

In other words, if you are involved in an accident, you can't collect from another driver if he is at fault for damage to your car, and he can't collect from you for damage to his car if you are at fault.

This means that, to recover for damage to your car, you will need collision insurance. And because of this change, most companies will be offering some options to the present standard type of deductible collision

insurance.

The restrictions which the new law puts on the use of the fault system are in response to the major criticisms of the present system upon which the move to the no-fault concept was based.

They are intended to stop major reliance on the fault system for injury loss recovery, and to convert insurance dollars which now have to go for delays, inequities, and cost excesses of the fault process into the payment of actual injury costs for all accident victims.

THE THIRD BASIC CHANGE

Now that we have covered the basic changes in the system, and what they seek to accomplish, the important question is: How will this affect you?

To begin with, if you happen to have an uninsured motor vehicle, you should be preparing to do something about it.

But if you now are an insured motorist, the October first date poses no problem for you. Your insurer automatically will apply the required new coverages and delete those which no longer apply.

You will be getting from your company a general description of the new program, a detailed statement of how your policy is

The only persons excluded from the benefits are a vehicle owner who does not meet the insurance requirements, or a person who knowingly drives a car without the owner's permission.

Motorists from other states injured in accidents in Michigan will have the no-fault benefits if their insurance in Michigan. It will be optional with those not licensed here.

No-fault benefits are intended to be paid promptly and with a minimum of detail, but the providing of reasonable proof of injury and amount of loss will be required.

Payments delayed more than 30 days after reasonable proof of injury and amount of loss will be required.

Payments delayed more than 30 days after reasonable proof of injury may recover its attorney fee if he should find it necessary to take collection action, and a company may recover its attorney fee for defense against a fraudulent or unreasonable payment demand.

THE COST OF YOUR INSURED INSURANCE also will be adjusted according to how your insurer evaluates the probable effect of the law's changes on your particular loss exposure, and what variables in the coverages you may wish to use. Undoubtedly, many individuals will pay about the same as at present; some will pay more, and some will pay less.

It also can be expected that both coverage offerings and costs will undergo some changes as companies begin to get answers to many questions about the effect of the changes which now are uncertain.



39. QUESTION: What if my spouse or child is injured by a hit and run driver?

ANSWER: Your policy covers the named person, his or her spouse, and all relatives in the same household. (Sec. 3111 and 3114). Therefore your spouse or child living at home would be paid by your insurance company.

40. QUESTION: Now I've got you. What if I am a pedestrian, who doesn't drive, has no relative with a policy, have no insurance at all, and am injured in Michigan by a hit and run driver?

ANSWER: You are protected by the assigned claims fund. (Sec. 3172). This is a fund set up by the new law and financed by all the automobile insurance companies to provide funds to take care of the example you just gave. (Sec. 3171)

COSTS

41. QUESTION: This all sounds pretty good -- but won't it cost me more?

ANSWER: Many people will pay less, some will pay more. The new no-fault system will save much of the money that now goes for lawyer's expenses, duplication of other insurance programs and so-called "pain and suffering." This saving is being used to provide more adequate benefits to more people for medical bills and lost wages.

Whether you will pay more or less than you do now will depend on how much insurance you have now, the make and model of your car, your income level and number of dependents, where you live, the deductibles you select, and last, but not least, which insurance company you have. The price of auto insurance varies substantially from one insurance company to another. No insurance company will know for

sure what the new system will cost until several years after it goes into effect. So in the meantime each insurance company will have to base its prices on its own estimates of what the new system will cost.

One of the major purposes of Michigan's new no-fault auto insurance law is to severely restrict the use of the legal fault system for recovery of accident injury loss.

The tort (fault) liability law traditionally has been the dominant factor in governing the nature of auto insurance payments, but the emphasis now will shift to no-fault compensation when the new law takes effect on October 1.

2. QUESTION: Do I have to have auto insurance after October 1, 1973?

ANSWER: Yes. Everyone in Michigan who owns a car must have auto insurance after October 1, 1973. (Sec. 3101)
3. QUESTION: I already have auto insurance. Is there anything more I need to do before the new law takes effect?

ANSWER: Your insurance policy will automatically cover you for at least the required coverages beginning on October 1, 1973. So there is nothing you have to do unless you want to change your optional coverages such as collision insurance, or your deductible. Before the new program goes into effect next October 1, your insurance agent or your insurance company will contact you and will let you know what coverages are required, what deductibles and additional coverages are

MEDICAL BENEFITS

4. QUESTION: What are the benefits under the new law for medical expenses and rehabilitation?

ANSWER: Medical expenses and rehabilitation as much as and as long as necessary (Sec. 3107).

There are other benefits for wage loss, child care, dependents in case of death, and property damage which will be described later.

5. QUESTION: Please be more specific. Do you mean if I am in an auto accident and have Michigan no-fault auto insurance and get seriously hurt, I can have my doctor and hospital bills paid for life?

ANSWER: Yes. (Sec. 3107(a)). This is one of the best features of the Michigan law.

ANSWER: You get medical benefits for life -- regardless of who or what caused the auto accident. (Sec. 3105(2) and 3107(a))

11. QUESTION: What kind of benefits can I receive of any wage loss?

ANSWER: You will receive your regular earnings (minus 15% to make up for the fact that there is no income tax on insurance benefits) for a maximum of \$1,000 a month and a total of 3 years if unable to work. (Sec. 3107(b)) ANSWER: If you do not take an optional deductible in your auto insurance you would collect duplicate benefits for whatever Blue Cross or sickness and accident benefits cover. But you may take an optional deductible in your auto policy which will reduce your premium and eliminate some or all of the duplication with your other insurance and ben-ANSWER: Hospital care is limited to a semi-private room, unless special or intensive care is needed. (Sec. 3107) You may take various kinds of optional deductibles, especially if you already have some hospital and medical insurance, in

ANSWER: Yes, that is the only limitation. (Sec. 3107)

ANSWER: You don't get double

ANSWER: Yes. You would receive \$127.50 a week in benefits (\$150.00 minus 15%). (Sec. 3107). In addition, you could receive up to \$20.00 a day for the reasonable cost of child care-so long as you were unable to care for the children, to a maximum of 3 years. But the total for wage loss benefits and child care benefits is limited to \$1,000.00 per month. If the cost of child care is over \$20.00 a day and if you could prove fault of the other driver, you could sue for the amount of the cost over what you collect from your own Insurance policy. (Sec. 3135(2) (c))

16. QUESTION: I am a housewife with small children. Believe me I work 20 hours a day, seven days a week (sometimes it seems like nine), caring for the kids, but I get no pay check. If I am injured can I receive any benefits similar to a wage loss?

ANSWER: Yes -- up to \$20.00 a compensation -- you don't make money on being in the hospital. Workmen's Compensation or Social Security benefits would be subtracted. (Sec. 3109(1)).






