We Recommend: 'Yes' On Consolidation

Editorial

Unification is the single most important issue that must inevitably be faced by residents of the township and city of Plymouth.

Consolidation is the preferable form of unification — as opposed to annexation — because it allows residents of both communities to participate equally in the formation of a new governmental unit with a modern charter.

Plymouth Township Supervisor J.D. McLaren and Treasurer Elizabeth Holmes have said that an affirmative vote on Tuesday's consolidation advisory question on the township ballot would indicate to them a unification study is needed.

For that reason, and since township and city residents would have an opportunity to determine the final outcome of unification, we support a "yes" vote on the consolidation advisory question Tuesday.

It is time, in light of growth of the township and city, to consider a unified effort at solving the greater Plymouth community's problems.

The State Boundary Commission is expected to soon approve a 1970 petition seeking consolidation of Plymouth Township and Plymouth. If it does, it may then call a binding consolidation referendum by the end of this year.

But before the residents of the two communities can weigh how best to join together, they must be able to see the facts. A study is definitely needed and soon.

McLaren has said the most probable catalyst to such a study is the consolidation advisory question.

We laud the township officials' stand on the matter and strongly urge Plymouth Township residents to vote

Tuesday and to vote "yes" on the consolidation question.

Also on Tuesday's ballot in Plymouth Township will be two referendums.

The first deals with extending the Byron Creek Sewer into the western portion of the township. It was a petition drive launched against this move that forced the election.

The argument against extending the sewer has centered around the fact that this would open the western portion of the township to development.

We believe the township board and its planning commission have fostered above-average development thus far and there is no reason to expect that to change — sewer or not.

What the opposition to the sewer has

lost sight of is the health and safety factor involved and the fact that development is going to take place anyway — making it necessary some day to put in sewers.

We urge a "yes" vote on the sewer extension referendum.

The second proposal on the ballot is one which would allow the township to purchase the 65-acre Hilltop golf course for about \$400,000.

Township officials have said the purchase of the self-paying course would be made with federal revenue sharing monies and would not necessitate money from the general fund.

The purchase would greatly enhance the township's recreation program and we recommend a "yes" vote on the proposal.

Moceri Project Dead; Canton Land Use Study Released

CANTON

The Moceri Project, as it was originally proposed, is dead.

That announcement, made to The Plymouth Mail & Observer Monday by Gilbert Franklin, an attorney for Moceri Builders, overshadowed Tuesday night's release of the long awaited Canton Township Citizens Advisory Council land use study.

Franklin said his company is currently undertaking drastic revision of its plans for the 194-acre site at Joy and Sheldon Roads and will now propose a local shopping center of about 200,000 square feet, an office complex, and single and multi-family housing units.

Originally the company had proposed a regional shopping center that would be larger than Westland Center, high-rise housing units and a smaller single and multi-family housing development for the site.

That plan sparked much controversy from area homeowners whose protests were credited by Franklin with defeating the project.

It was also those protests and concerns expressed by Canton residents about the increasing number of multiple family units being permitted in the township that led to creation of the Citizens Advisory Council.

Franklin said those "forces in the community are responsible" for the Moceri company's change in development plans. "Maybe this is democracy in action," he added.

"We've just gotten to a point where we're carrying this on our back and we can't do it."

"We've got to do something with this land," Franklin said.

Next Week's Edition Due On Thursday

Although the revised plan is not finished, he said, it will include the local shopping center and a 10-acre office and entertainment complex in the eastern portion of the parcel separated by Morton Taylor Road.

"We've taken everything away from the Sheldon-Joy area and completely eliminated all multi-story buildings," Franklin said.

"We'll submit it (the new proposal) as soon as we get it drawn up."

Franklin said the new proposal would basically be a planned unit development "with a small, local shopping center in one portion."

He said he was disappointed in the company being forced to make the

area into a less significant development.

The new proposal will be "much less than what we felt was worthwhile for this property."

While the Moceri Project was not specifically mentioned in the Citizens Advisory Council report released to the Canton Township board Tuesday night, commercial development was one facet to which the report paid particular attention.

Some of the key policies which the report recommended were:

- Establishment of guidelines to balance population growth with availability of community facilities.
- Acknowledgement that presently used and zoned ag-

ricultural land in the township will at some time in the future assume an urban zoning classification.

- Revision of planned unit development standards to provide less overall density, fewer multiple housing units, more open space and lot reductions.

- Adoption of a policy to provide school sites in planned unit developments which would be sold to the school district for \$1, but that such school sites could be used by the developer to determine overall density and to meet open space requirements.

The 19-page report was the product of some 23 weeks of study by the 27-member

LWV Supports Consolidation

The Plymouth-Northville League of Women Voters has endorsed a "yes" vote for the consolidation advisory question on Tuesday's ballot in Plymouth Township.

The LWV, which is non-partisan and never endorses candidates, does endorse important issues after "careful study."

The text of the LWV's endorsement of the Plymouth consolidation advisory question follows:

"After a careful two-year study on community services, the League of Women Voters urges the citizens in Plymouth Township to vote 'Yes' on Sept. 4 on the advisability of consolidation between the city and township of Plymouth.

"In light of population growth and density, additional services must be provided to the larger community such as:

- Police — With the pending withdrawal of the Wayne County Sheriff Dept. on Nov. 30, it becomes obvious that the township needs police protection. For this protection, the township would then need to pay the sheriff's department, contract with another police department or hire its own force — any one of which moves would incur additional expense and require additional tax money.
- Fire — Separate fire departments necessitate additional fire stations, duplication of effort and equipment, and therefore are more costly.
- Public works — Refuse collection is not provided by the township government.

Consolidation would mean a reduced cost per pickup.

"A consolidation plan will offer better services and more efficient government with increased local control. Consolidation, unlike annexation, affords the citizens of both communities the opportunity to choose the form of government that best suits their needs.

"If the advisory vote passes, the township has indicated it will conduct a study on consolidation. As there is a need for current information to be available to the electorate so that they can make an intelligent decision, the League of Women Voters supports a 'Yes' vote (on consolidation) in the Sept. 4 election."

Campaign Planned For Consolidation

Beginning Thursday, Plymouth Township homes will be receiving leaflets urging a "yes" vote on Tuesday's consolidation advisory question.

According to Dr. Gary Hall of 12031 Amherst Court, Plymouth Township, the consolidation campaign will also include phone calls to township voters on the day of the election.

Hall, who filed a petition in 1970 asking for consolidation of the two communities, said the campaign is stressing the vote's advisory nature and township officials' statements that a favorable vote would lead to a unification study.

"We're stressing that the issue ought to be examined," Hall said. "It's certainly an issue that ought to be studied in detail."

The State Boundary Commission is expected to rule on Hall's petition soon. If it approves the petition, the commission may call a binding consolidation election by the end of this year.

"We need to get a study going," Hall said.

The campaign is using signature lists from the 1970 petition drive and voter registration lists, he explained. Voters who signed the petitions and are still registered to vote "get special treatment" by the campaign, Hall added.

"We're going to try contacting every registered voter," he concluded.

College Offers Courses On Women's Role

Four new courses focusing on the changing roles and concerns of women will be offered by Schoolcraft College this fall.

The courses were announced by Mrs. Nancy DuFour who heads the women's continuum program conducted by Schoolcraft's community services office. The four are "Women in Society," "The Emerging Roles of Women," "Women's Study Skills Refresher," and "Women: Joy in the Middle Years."

Registration for these courses may be completed by mail through Sept. 4, or by person at the Registrar's Office from Aug. 20 until the second meeting of each class. Tuition for persons residing within the college district is \$11 per course. Out-of-district students pay double this amount.

"Women in Society" will meet from 7:30 to 9:30 on Thursday evenings beginning Sept. 27. It will examine the roles of women, past and present, through the reading and discussion of works such as the Bible, Greer, Mead and Friedan.

The course will include the presentation of viewpoints on the historical, educational and career status of women by guest speakers.

"The Emerging Roles of Women" will be held from 1 to 3 on Tuesday afternoons beginning Sept. 25. This course is designed to increase awareness of the traditional roles of women

and how they developed, give an overview of the current status of women in relation to education, employment, the law and life styles, and examine new alternatives.

"Women's Study Skills Refresher" will meet on Wednesday evenings from 7 to 9 beginning Sept. 26. It will assist returning students in defining the skills necessary for successful learning and in developing some proficiency in them. The main areas of concentration will be reading improvement, test taking, note taking, time and energy management and blocks to learning.

"Women: Joy in the Middle Years" will meet on Thursday afternoons from 1 to 3 beginning Sept. 27. Designed to increase awareness of the psychological and lifestyle changes brought about in women by the aging process, it will deal with the unique adjustments required of women in this society as they move away from their early roles of full time wife and mother.

The course will include the experiences of single women at this time in life and will assist participants in devel-

oping some basic skills necessary for their new roles.

All four courses will be held at or near Schoolcraft's campus at 18600 Haggerty Road in Livonia. For additional information, call the Continuum Program at the college.

Twp. Developer Complains Of 'No Police Protection'

PLYMOUTH One of Plymouth Township's largest land owners, Donovan Associates Inc., has criticized the township government for "inadequate" police and fire protection.

The president of the Detroit development firm, Greg Donovan, recently wrote a letter to township officials

blaming the township for the state of the house on the former Brinks Farm on Ann Arbor Road.

The township has ordered Donovan to demolish the house and out buildings on the farm, which his firm now owns.

Donovan's letter, which was "received and filed" by the township board at its Aug. 14 meeting, says:

"We have recently been advised by the township that we must raze the house and out buildings at the above site. Upon being so advised, I feel it necessary to share with you a digest of the thoughts that occur to me at such a time:

- We pay in excess of \$60,000 per year in taxes to Plymouth Township.

- No children in the Plymouth school system come from our properties.

- Since a major building next door to the fire hall (Lofy's Restaurant) burned to the ground two years ago, we are convinced that we have no fire protection.

- Within the last year at the Brinks Farm, we have had the following items stolen: three extra large picnic tables, the bath tub, the commode, the kitchen sink. Therefore, the obvious conclusion is that we have no police protection.

- To date, services rendered by Plymouth Township to us have consisted singularly in denying us the opportunity to develop any of our property, such denials

being an outgrowth of every attempt of zoning thus far made by our firm.

"Since the township has made the Brinks Farm virtually unrentable by its failure to provide adequate police protection, we are now advised by the township that the building must be razed costing in excess of \$9,000. I

regard said \$9,000 as an 'additional tax' by the township growing out of its own failures.

"In summary, I have but a single question:

"What has Plymouth Township provided us in exchange for nearly a quarter million dollars paid by this firm for property taxes?"

City Police Arrests Set Record

PLYMOUTH Last week was a busy one for the Plymouth Police Department.

From Aug. 16 through Aug. 23, the department recorded 17 arrests, a record number, according to Police Chief Timothy Ford.

"Our average arrest figure for a month is 30," Ford said, "with the bulk of these being warrant arrests for other police departments."

Making up the 17 arrests this past week were five in assisting the Livonia Police Department, six warrant arrests for other agencies, one "carrying concealed weapons" arrest, two traffic arrests, and four drug related arrests, the chief said.

Ford praised the work of his officers in assisting Livonia police in the arrest of several members of a suspected robbery ring.



Dismissal Sought Of Trio's Charges In Restaurant Death

PLYMOUTH
 Because of conflicting evidence by prosecution witnesses, defense attorneys for three persons charged with the second degree murder of Karl Godina are expected to ask District Judge Dunbar Davis to dismiss the charges.

Davis said he will rule in about three weeks on a defense motion of dismissal.

The pre-trial exam, held to determine whether the defendants should stand trial later in Wayne County Circuit Court, was held Monday in Plymouth District Court.

Charged with beating Godina to death Aug. 17 in a Plymouth Township restaurant are Henry E. Peer, 25, and Terry W. Lee, 18, both of Plymouth, and Phyllis Williams, 26, of Livonia.

Although the prosecution charged they beat Godina with their fists and catsup bottles and kicked him to death, an assistant county medical examiner had conflicting testimony.

Dr. George Russanow testified that Godina died of "manual strangulation" and not from beating, as charged.

Other persons testified Godina was actually the aggressor in the fight in the Palace Restaurant, 1507 W. Ann Arbor Rd.

And none testified to seeing Godina grabbed by the neck in a way that would cause strangulation.

Godina, a National Tool and Die Welding Co. employee from Livonia, was pronounced dead on arrival at St. Mary Hospital following the fight.

Defense attorneys have until Sept. 13 to file briefs with Judge Davis.

Rescue Truck, 6 Cars Crash

GARDEN CITY

An Inkster driver was ticketed for hitting a Canton Township rescue truck Sunday night in an accident that resulted in seven vehicles being damaged at the Ford-Middle Belt intersection.

Richard Dovin, 18, was ticketed by Garden City police for failing to yield right of way to the emergency vehicle which was carrying a heart attack patient to Garden City Osteopathic Hospital.

Dorvin told officers that he saw a green light and a clear lane before entering the intersection and colliding with the rescue truck.

Joseph LaPate, 75, of Dearborn Heights, spent the night in the hospital for observation while his daughter, whom he has been visiting in Canton Township, suffered cuts on the face from the smashed windshield of the rescue truck.

Immediately after the collision with the rescue truck, Dovin's car continued through the intersection at an angle and struck other cars, creating a chain reaction involving Dovin and five other autos.

Injured were Canton Township firemen Steve Berger, Paul Paulun and Sgt. Larry Longwish, who were treated at Garden City Hospital and released.

Other drivers involved in the collision were John Russell of Garden City; James Kurkapski of Plymouth; Molly Dubbs of Southfield, and Charles Hollar of Livonia.

The Antique Mart, a part of the Plymouth Fall Festival, will be housed this year for the first time in the Cultural Center.



There is more than a bit of truth in the old saying that you can take the boy out of the country but that you can't take the country out of the boy.

It has been many years since he took that stroll through the groves where tent after tent was sponsored by church groups serving the notorious Lehigh County sauerkraut dinners, and the midway leading to the grandstand, had the usual coterie of freak shows, hootchie-kootchie dancers and the never-to-be-forgotten "barkers" at the large spinning wheels and games of chance.

It was along this route that The Stroller, then in the flower of youth, lost some of his innocence. No, it wasn't at the "girlie" shows, or even at the race track where the county's best harness horses vied for honors each afternoon.

It came about in a most unusual manner and the memory of it has given The Stroller many a real laugh through the years.

It all started innocently enough when he accepted a neighbor's invitation to wait on the tables at the church tent and help serve the sauerkraut (one can almost smell it now).

On the day before the fair opened, we were sitting in

the tent getting instructions when a rather sharp looking individual stopped off and, coming over to The Stroller, asked, "How would you like to work for me this week?"

Told that it was impossible in that he was helping out a friend, the sharp looking gent countered: "That's all right. You can work for me, too. 'I'd like you to be a 'shill'."

"What's that?" the stranger was asked. "Here's what you do," he answered. "My wheel is in down the path a bit and each time you walk down to answer Nature's call during the day, just stand in the group at my stand and listen to me talking."

"When you hear me say, 'Come in and try it for a dime. PLEASE come in and try it for a dime,' that will be a signal for you to come and lay a dime on a number and play the game of spin the wheel. It's easy and I'll give a dollar a day."

Well that seemed simple enough. So the next day, along about noon, The Stroller went for his first walk. Stopping in front of his new found friend's wheel he heard the plea, "PLEASE come in and try it for a dime."

Through the crowd he went, laid his dime on the counter at a number of his own choosing - and sure enough, it was the winning number.

"Will you take the doll or a dollar?"

That was easy. The Stroller took the dollar and fig-

It wasn't that simple - and before the day was done, much of his youthful innocence vanished.

Continued from Page 1A council which was made up of representatives from various types of groups in the township.

In connection with the council's report, Canton

Township Planner Michael Manore is presently preparing a specific land use plan for the township.

The existing plan was adopted in 1961 and updated by Manore last spring.

The council's report made the following recommendations about commercial use and zoning:

•A land use plan should delineate the general areas and amounts of commercial land in the township and any variance from the plan must be supported by an adequate market analysis indicating a need for proposed use.

•Proposed commercial properties on the west side of the township shall not be zoned until a market study and plan is submitted verifying the need for commercial zoning.

•Shopping centers should be located at the intersection of two major highways.

•No further strip commercial development along highways should be permitted and spot zoning for commercial uses should not be permitted.

The report also calls for the township to develop a farmers' market and to prohibit expansion of Mettetal Airport to handle jet aircraft in order to protect neighboring residential areas.

A complete copy of the council's report is available for inspection in Canton Township Hall.

7 Area Grididders On U-M Roster

There is nothing superstitious about Bo Schembechler who is starting his fifth season as head coach of the University of Michigan's football forces.

Standing in front of the football writers and TV commentators at the annual press breakfast, he didn't even cross his fingers or knock on wood while predicting the Wolverines will be in the thick of the battle for the Big Ten title and another trip to the Rose Bowl.

"We've got 30 members of last year's squad back," he said, "and we also have our complete double backfield returning."

"If we have a weakness any place, it is in our offensive line and we have plenty of talent on hand to fill the gaps. However, it may take a game or two to find the right replacements."

Realizing he might be asked about the ground game and the offense inside the five yard line that failed so miserably against Ohio State last fall, Bo was quick to announce that Michigan quarterbacks would be given more options this year -- "but not in our territory."

"Sure, we will pass a bit more," the Wolverine chief said, "but we'll have our running game, too. Don't forget, you can't win football games without a running attack."

He stressed the work being done to prevent "turnovers" in Michigan territory. To show the importance of this phase that often is overlooked by the spectators, he released a most interesting statistic.

"During the past four years," he said, "we lost the ball on turnovers 51 times inside our own 45-yard line and 11 touchdowns were scored against us."

"On the other hand, we gained possession inside the opposition 45-yard line 103 times and scored 66 touchdowns and seven field goals."

"So, you can see how important it will be that we don't gamble too much in our own territory."

For the second straight year Schembechler is counting heavily on two former Observerland high school stars...Bob Thornbladh of Plymouth and Craig Mutch of Thurston High.

Thornbladh, a senior, will make another attempt at wrestling the starting fullback job away from Ed Shuttlesworth, the hard plunging Ohioan. Even though he may not start, Bob is certain to see a lot of service.

After missing a season because of an injury, Mutch had a good season last fall and Schembechler is certain he will be one of the bulwarks in the defensive backfield when the title chase starts.

Five other Observerland players are on the squad. They include Jon Cederberg, former Plymouth High quarterback; Mike Day, a linebacker from Livonia; Kirk Lewis, an offensive tackle from Garden City; Don Brandon, a defensive end from Plymouth, and Art Fediuk, of Livonia.


Two other players have caught Schembechler's fancy and he predicts great seasons for them.

The first is Paul Theal, a six-foot-six tight end, who is showing more speed than ever and will be used on long, downfield passes. The other is Gil Chapman.

"If you think Chapman was fast last year," Bo said to the writers, "wait until you see him this year. He's better than ever."

"And then there's Gordon Bell, a tailback from Ohio, who is going to see a lot of service."

All of Bo's remarks added up to the fact that optimism is at a higher pitch than usual with the opening game against Iowa coming up Sept. 15.

Turf Tips, Quips

Neither the Detroit Race Course nor Hazel Park Raceway quite reached their goals Saturday but each was well on the way.

The DRC management has ambitions of reaching a \$1.5 million handle on its third Saturday but had to be content with \$1,247,513 with a crowd of 13,045 passing through the turnstiles.

Hazel Park is still trying for the elusive million dollar night but settled for its biggest single night handle with an audience of 11,419 sending \$951,064 through the mutuel machines.

That was the most wagered this season, bettering the \$949,489 on Aug. 11. The high previous to this season was \$874,950 on April 18, 1970.

With 22 nights gone in the 82-night season, Hazel Park has now handled \$1,534,000 more in wagers than it did in the 1972 season over the same span.

The average mutuel handle to date is \$704,741, up 11 per cent over last year. Average nightly attendance is 8,034 a hike of 2.4 per cent over the same number of nights in 1972.

Chris Boring, the youthful veteran from Adrian, stole the honors in Saturday's \$7,500 invitational when he drove Shiaway Lad from last at the head of the stretch to a length victory over highly favored Hoover in 2:00.1.

Hoover, driven by Doug Ackerman, and Easy Irv, with Bea Farber in the sulky, were dueling for the top spot when Shiaway Lad came storming down the out-side for the triumph.

Hoover wound up second with Easy Irv a nose away in third.

Shiaway Lad, an Adios Cleo seven-year-old, was purchased for \$10,000 as a yearling, and now shows earnings of more than \$242,000.

Kilfoil, once a cheap claimer from Ohio, captured the \$22,500 added Frontier Handicap at the DRC, pulling away from its competition in the long stretch to win as it pleased.

Kilfoil had four lengths over second place Tattle Mar, part of the Mike Basson estate entry, with Play Fashion a fast closing third.

Jockey Larry Snyder and Trainer Jack Van Berg continued their sensational winning ways. Snyder added two firsts to his long list for a total of 49 for the first three weeks of the 90-day campaign.

It was Snyder and Van Berg in the 10th and final race with Southern Triumph. That gave the blonde Nebraskan 26 wins thus far and placed him far ahead of R.L. Irwin in second place.

Although nothing new has been announced on the tampering with four horses that caused cancellation of the ninth race last Monday, we hear the investigation is continuing at the Detroit Race Course.

Three trainers have been banned from the track for alleged discovery of needles and other barred items in their cars and trucks. Each has announced plans to appeal the suspension in the courts.

In the meantime, Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley had told of efforts to get the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Association, which has charge of the track security at the DRC, to add additional men to its staff.

All of which brings back recollections of the supposed investigation of fixed races during the Jackson at Northville meeting last January.

At the time Shirley and his investigators reportedly involved several drivers and at least one owner in the supposed effort to tamper with horses in the trifecta races.

During the same period, the Ontario Harness Racing Commission was investigating similar charges there. The commission devoted considerable time to probing activities at Windsor Raceway and finally wound up with a lifetime suspension to Driver-Trainer Terry Butler, of Clinton, Mich. with long suspensions to two others.


While Ontario was completing the task, Michigan continued its probe, turned some information over to the Attorney General's office and nothing has happened to date.

During the probe the names of several prominent drivers leaked out as involved and one reportedly admitted participation in such activities.

But what we are pointing out is that eight months later nothing has come out of that investigation ... and that's why we are inclined to think nothing more will be unveiled at the DRC.

Apparently there's a difference in the way such matters are handled in Ontario and in Michigan.



New SC Work Called 'Sloppy'

The new addition to Schoolcraft College's Applied Science building shows evidence of "sloppy workmanship," according to Schoolcraft Trustee Arch Vallier.

Vallier told the board of trustees meeting that the concrete work in front of the building was a poor job and

said he observed cracking around the pillars.

Vallier suggested the final payment and retention fee on the building not be paid until the contractor fixes the problems. The board unanimously agreed.

Vallier said he couldn't find much wrong inside the building and described the work as "excellent."

Kenneth Lindner, vice president for administrative affairs, reported that the building is substantially complete. However, additional drains, manholes, curbing and sidewalks are yet to be completed.

Schoolcraft House Is 'Run Down'

While building construction is going on at Schoolcraft College, the home of the man for whom the college was named is in a bad state of repair.

This was the report brought to the Schoolcraft board of trustees by President C. Nelson Grote on Henry Rowe Schoolcraft's home in Sault Sainte Marie.

On a recent visit to the home, Dr. Grote spoke with Stuart Moran, head of Sault Ste. Marie committee concerned with preservation of the home. It reportedly is trying to get the house listed in the U.S. Historical Registry.

According to Grote, the home, built in 1826, hasn't been occupied in many years and is run down.

He reported the front porch of the two-story frame house had fallen on the ground.

Grote said the question now is whether to restore the home or completely rebuild it.

"We may be called upon to help in this project, and I think we should be prepared to do so."

Schoolcraft, a 19th century ethnologist, explorer, scholar, author and cousin of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, had a strong influence on the early development of Michigan.

Madonna, OCC Get Grants

Madonna College in Livonia and Oakland Community College have received grants totaling \$82,500 for community service and continuing education programs.

The grants were approved by the State Board of Education from a total state allocation of nearly \$500,000 from the Higher Education Act of 1965.

Madonna received \$42,500 to operate a one-year child development training program for 50 persons.

Oakland Community College received \$40,000 to expand community services and continuing education programs for Spanish-speaking persons in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties. OCC operates a campus, Orchard Ridge, in Farmington at I-696 and Orchard Lake Road.

Folding Doors Space Savers

Got a hang-up about closets?
Here are some hints on handling common closet problems.
Do closets look dull? Make them an elegant room accent by installing louver doors of ponderosa pine. The doors come fully-louvered, or with louvers above solid wood panels.
They can be used singly or in series, and are obtainable in swing-out, sliding or folding styles.
Paint them to blend or contrast with room decor, or stain the wood to enhance its rich natural grain.
Worried about mildew? The free circulation of air permitted through louvers helps keep closets - and their contents - dry and fresh-smelling. (It's dampness that causes mildew and mustiness.)
Need more storage space? It's possible to have closets


in relatively small foyers and narrow hallways.
Doors make the difference here, too. Where there is not enough floor clearance for "swing-out" doors, use folding or sliding styles.
Folding doors open and close accordion-fashion, so they require minimal floor space. Sliding doors which move on tracks need no floor space at all.

The Green Thumb

By GEORGE ABRAHAM

We've had information about these pests before, but would like to mention them again.

The large, gray, paper nests, shaped somewhat like a football and located in trees and shrubs, are the product of one of the hornet species - not of honey bees.

Each nest starts new in the spring and becomes maximum size in the fall. Only the queens, the laying females, overwinter. Meanwhile the nest is ruined during the winter by birds and other animals seeking the remaining larvae. The nest is not reused the following year.

When hornets become a problem, your best bet is to control them with an aerosol spray designed for wasps and bees. Some of these aerosols are equipped with special nozzles allowing you to remain eight to 12 feet away.

Spray in the evening when the hornets are in the nest, directing the spray at the entrance hole at the bottom of the nest. Repeat if necessary.

Yellow jackets are often confused with honey bees, but they have definite black and yellowish bands on the abdomen.

Yellow jackets nest in the ground or along foundations and are often encountered

while trimming shrubs, mowing, weeding, etc. The nest is also a paper nest and is located several inches to a underground.

Spray or dust the entrance hole of the nest, using a wasp or hornet aerosol or a prepared spray or dust containing Sevin (carbaryl).

The gardenia is one of the toughest house plants there is to blossom. In a greenhouse, the gardenia is at home, but in the average home, it is out of place.

In its native China, the gardenia grows in a cool, moist climate on hillsides where drainage is never lacking.

It likes high humidity. Pots can be placed on a tray of dampened pebbles. Also, the foliage can be sprayed or syringed frequently. Place a plastic sheet over the plant to maintain humidity and to prevent buds from dropping.

This plant likes good light, but not direct sunlight. Give it a bright window. Best night temperature is 60 to 65 degrees and day temperature around 70 to 75 degrees. Putting the plant outdoors in summer is a common practice as it helps buds form.

Start new plants by tip cuttings from your original plant. Cuttings can be four to six inches long. Remove the

bottom foliage and insert stems in moist sand, or sand-peat mixture.

GREEN THUMB CLINIC:
"Our squash grew fine until suddenly they started to wilt. What caused this?"

Answer. Sounds like the squash borer. It hits squash, cucumbers, pumpkins and even melons. Next year, spray the vines at base of runners with methoxychlor two tablespoons to a gallon of water (or you can use Sevin, same rate). Give two doses at seven day intervals. After harvest collect vines and burn.

Begonias Make Dazzling Display

Rieger begonias, new hybrid begonias being grown by many area gardeners, produce a great quantity of large blossoms for a dazzling display.

They can be grown as bedding plants in the garden, but are most striking when grown in pots or hanging baskets.

These award winning begonias add still more variety to a group of plants that already includes many interesting kinds of house and garden plants.

Among the warm-climate types that are popular greenhouse or house plants are angel-wings begonias and Rex begonias. These have

large exotic leaves that are beautifully marked with silver, wine-red, or purple.

Christmas begonias have roundish, light green leaves and terminal clusters of delicate pink flowers. The plants, which grow best in a cool greenhouse, reach 18 to 24 inches in height. By removing buds until November, they can be had in full bloom at Christmas time.

The wax begonias include many beautiful kinds that flower freely over a long period of time.

These begonias, like the Christmas begonias, have a fibrous root system. They are available in a variety of colors and sizes. The dwarfs, which are excellent edging plants in sunny or semi-shady areas of the gar-

den, grow six to eight inches tall. Flowers are in shades of white, pink, rose or red, and leaves can vary from pale green to deep green and even a bronzy hue.

Other kinds of wax begonias can reach a foot in height. These are widely used for bedding plants and also make a good display in pots and baskets. Most have a multitude of rather small flowers, but a few kinds have blooms up to three inches across.

In addition to the single-flowered forms, one occasionally sees wax begonias with fluffy little double blooms that look like minute roses.

The tuberous begonias are among the most striking and colorful plants to be found in

the garden. These, as their name implies, grow from large underground tubers. These are not hardy in our climate, and the tubers are stored indoors for the winter.

They are potted and started into growth in late winter or early spring, and during the summer provide a wonderful display of exotic blooms in vibrant shades of pink, red, yellow or orange.

Some blooms look like roses or camellias. Others are bell-shaped. There are many varieties with trailing branches that are ideally suited to growing in hanging baskets.

The new Rieger begonias, named for the German grower who hybridized them, are a cross between the Christmas begonias and the tu-

berous begonias. The plants are vigorous, the leaves are large and glossy, and the flowers are large and brightly colored.

Two types have been introduced. A kind called Aphrodite has double flowers. Those with single flowers are called Schwabenland.

Many shades of rose, red, and pink are available. There is also an orange Schwabenland and a yellow and pink bi-color Aphrodite.

The Schwabenland plants tend to grow upright and are best as pot plants. They are vigorous branching plants. The Aphrodites have a more trailing, spreading habit and are better for use in hanging baskets. However, they can be used in pots, and kept upright if they are staked.

The Rieger begonias seem to do best in partially shaded areas. They flower well, and flower colors are more intense than when they are grown in sun.

The same plants that produced such an abundant display all summer can be brought indoors when cool weather comes. There they will continue the display. Indoors in winter, they should be grown in a sunny window.

A loose, light, porous soil is best for begonias. A mixture of about 40 per cent peat moss, 40 per cent perlite and 20 per cent soil is considered ideal. Feed the plants every week or two, but avoid excessive fertilizing, which will result in lots of leafy growth and fewer flowers.

Pest Of The Week

The small branches of Russian olive both in the nursery and home ground are showing a great deal of dieback in the spring of the year for the past several years.

It is caused by a fungus canker disease (*Fusicoccum elaeagni*). Damage varies from a small amount to sometimes as much as half the plant or more. Small black or dark brown cankers appear on the small dead branches.

CONTROL: Maintain plant in good growing condition by fertilization once a year, watering during drought, and avoiding root disturbance. Prune out and destroy infected material. No chemical control is available.

Swing Seat Easily Made

Swing seats that hang from porch beam or a sturdy limb can be made from two 1/2-foot lengths of 2x4-inch western wood, two 30-inch pieces of one-inch dowel, machine canvas, chain and four eye bolts.

The canvas, 31 by 66 inches, has three-inch side flaps for strength and loops are sewn at each end for the dowel to pass through.

The dowels are inserted through holes drilled near each end of the 2x4s, then eye bolts go through the ends of the dowels to keep the 2x4s snug against the canvas.

Lengths of 1 1/2-inch-link chain are fastened to the eye bolts with split link connectors. The back chains are shorter than the front to give a slant to the seat.

Adjustments of height off the ground and preferred slant are easy to make by taking up or letting out lengths of chain.

C'ville Cuts Operating Rate

Operating millage in the Clarenceville School District will be reduced by 0.39 mills, or about 1.1 per cent, in December tax bills.

For the average homeowner, it may mean a saving of \$7 to \$8, assuming his property valuation remains the same.

In the Livonia portion of the district, however, the to-

tal tax bill will rise a little because of a four per cent increase in the state equalization factor. That factor is the amount applied against all assessments so that all property statewide is assessed at 50 per cent of true cash value.

In the Farmington Hills sector, the SEV factor remains the same, so the cut in the tax rate will have its greatest impact there.

In the Redford Township portion of Clarenceville, the equalization factor was increased by nearly four per cent, so the effect will be much the same as in Livonia — a slight rise in Clarenceville tax bills.

The Clarenceville board of Education approved the new millage reduction last week after an "executive" (closed door secret) session that lasted about 20 minutes.

"This will reduce our operating millage to 33.5 mills," said Raymond Chaiken, board member. We will have a budget based on that tax spread."

Debt retirement millage amounts to 7.01 mills for the next school year for a total of 33.51 mills.

"Our budget is based on realistic costs," said Supt. Dave McDowell. "If we are in the red, then our fund equity will be reduced by that amount."

Although the millage reduction will mean a loss of about \$28,000 in revenue for the district, McDowell said the deficit this year could run as high as \$50,000 to \$60,000.

"The deficit is conceivable because employees take 60 per cent of our budget. We promised no cuts or reduction in services, but we have one of the highest millages, and we feel we just have to do something," explained McDowell.

Business Manager E.J. Salisz predicted the "school district will go into deficit fi-

nancing. He said that the fund equity, which he described as "the balance left over from other years," would be used.

Although at one time the fund equity amounted to about \$400,000, as of June 30, 1972, it amounted to \$272,000, according to Salisz.

"We're trying to run our budget as close as possible," he said. This is often difficult to predict when court suits are in progress.

Last year the district's property valuation was reduced by \$660,000 when the City of Livonia lost an assessment suit. This year Sears Roebuck Co. is appealing a \$1.2 million tax levy.

"If they win the appeal, we have to go back three years to pay back some taxes," Salisz said. "We have provided for this somewhat by reserving \$25,000 in the budget. If we win, then we can balance the budget."

There is a brighter side to the picture. "We will receive more revenue locally," Salisz commented.



\$42,500 To Madonna

Child Care Grant Made

Madonna College has been awarded a \$42,500 federal grant to help train older women and men to become child care aides.

The one-year 50-50 matching grant was allotted the Livonia college by the U.S. Dept. of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW).

The college contribution will be in the form of president's scholarships.

The program is designed to encourage those 35 or older, and who are interested in working with young children in pre-school education, to achieve 30 semester hours of credit and a certificate of achievement within a year's

time. The program may be "on the job."

A child development associate degree will be granted upon completion of two years in the program with past training, experience and future professional goals taken into consideration.

Credits earned are applicable to a bachelor degree.

Completion of the two-year course would qualify a student under Michigan law to become director of a day care center.

Applications now are being taken from residents of Livonia, its neighboring communities and Detroit.

Registrants may sign up at

the college any weekday between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Special arrangements to register at other times may be made by telephoning either Lois Kosheba, program director, or Sister Lauriana, academic dean.

Madonna hopes to start the program with between 60 and 70 students, Sister Lauriana said. Sister Mary Bridget, who drew up the program, will serve as co-director. She is chairman of the college's home economics and family life department.

"The child care program provides the trainee with a combination of field work and theoretical preparation,"

Sister Lauriana said. "This combination is provided in such a way as to help the trainee to integrate the learning which can come from both kinds of experiences."

"Field experiences interwoven with early childhood education principles and practices form the structure around which the child development aide and associate competency-based training is to be built."

"The strength of Madonna's program is that the faculty will evaluate the competencies of the child care aides and administer proficiency examinations in order to offer equivalency credits toward a certificate of achievement and an associate degree for older students."

Fire Protection Course Offered

Madonna College, Livonia, is the only private institution in Michigan which has initiated a program in fire protection and occupational safety.

The new program, commencing with the fall semester, will lead to a certificate of achievement, an associate degree or a bachelor of science degree, thereby allowing students to elect the program suited to their individual needs.

For those already in the fire protection and safety engineering field, this "career ladder" approach will lead to higher paying jobs in industry, fire protection, insurance, municipal fire departments, and government positions. Currently the national need for fire protection personnel is estimated to be more than 20 times the available supply.

Beginning students, not previously in the field, will develop competencies in fire protection, suppression and prevention.

Credits in safety or fire science earned at other institutions will be individually evaluated by Madonna College. Of the seven courses now being offered in the new fall program, four are being offered to previously experienced students either by examination or evaluation.

Students who have served in the areas of safety or fire fighting may earn credit by examination for "history and philosophy of fire protection and prevention" (FPOS 101 - three credits).

"Basic fire protection training" (FPOS 103) offers students who can prove their acquired knowledge, training and field experience by a

process of evaluation, three credit hours.

Rounding out the maximum of nine credit hours which may be awarded to previously experienced students, "field experience" (FPOS 302) carries three credit hours by evaluation for one year or more of full-time experience in the appropriate area.

Three advanced courses in fire protection and occupational safety offer four credit hours each.

The federal Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 will be the focal point of "safety and health standards, codes and regulations."

A seminar in fire protection and occupational safety (FPOS 405 - Soc 405) will be offered each Thursday evening from 7 to 10 p.m.



Crow's Nest

Mayflower Has New Look

PLYMOUTH

Avast ye, mates. For restaurateurs who wish to bathe in the atmosphere of 17th century sea life, they may now journey to rustic Plymouth and enjoy

the Mayflower Hotel's new lounge, "The Crow's Nest."

Replete with mermaid and pewter mugs, the restaurant is being designed from stem to stern, with the facelift including redecoration of the outside south wall of the hotel in appropriate style.

Mayflower management has been working since April in conjunction with Graham and Culotta architects in the \$100,000 project.

"It was inspired by a trip to our sister city, Plymouth, England," says Ralph Lorenz, Mayflower owner.

"We visited a lot of English pubs and decided to redecorate in order to capture the spirit they offered."

Scheduled for full operation by the Plymouth Fall Festival which opens Sept. 6, the restaurant's kitchen has been expanded to accommodate the additional 30-customer capacity.

Patrons are greeted by a cannon off the flagship of Admiral Lord Nelson which decorates the lobby. Only four such cannons exist.

On entering the dimly lit area, diners will immediately feel the spirit upon seeing the Crow's Nest ably manned by a mermaid which served formerly as a ship's decoration.

Walls are decorated with ships rigging, handcarved miniatures of seamen imported from Germany and a special wall of autographed log ends from around the world.

"The autograph idea was started after the Lord Mayor of Plymouth, England, visited the community and autographed one of the logs. Now we have signatures from people who have visited from all over the world," says Lorenz.

Adding to the atmosphere

is a group of dock piling set off in the corner. Lighting is primarily provided by ship's lanterns. Naturally, no sea-room would be complete without a ship's wheel and the "Crow's Nest" is no exception.

Handhewn timbers adorn the ceilings which complete the feeling of being below board in some ancient galloon.

Keeping the ale extra cold are numerous pewter mugs hung along the wall behind the bar.

Visitors will be fooled by the old-fashioned ice-box located behind the bar which is actually operated by electricity.

Plans are in the process to open a steak room opposite the "Crow's Nest," but as of yet are incomplete because of the beef shortage.

Restaurant Story Is Explained

The suburban area has some of the finest Chinese restaurants in the United States, a fact realized by the reviewer. The restaurant reviewed is a gracious addition. Those restaurants serving equally fine food shouldn't be concerned.

The criticism fits only those who don't live up to standard Chinese food. Names need not be mentioned. They know who they are.

Small Cars Are A Must These Days

An apologist for the auto industry, writing in one of the metropolitan dailies, warns that governmental pressure to build smaller cars that burn less gasoline "could affect the jobs of thousands of auto workers."

Just how many thousands, in an industry that employs perhaps a million American workers, is never spelled out. But the scare effect on the public is obvious.

Auto executives, when they're candid, will admit they hate small cars. Small cars bring in less revenue and earn smaller profits, and executive bonuses are based on revenues and profits. The fellows in the industry sneer at and bad-mouth small cars every chance they get.

We car buyers are shifting to small cars at an astounding pace, and for good reasons.

First, cars burn irreplaceable fossil fuel, and we can cut fuel consumption by half with a car that gets 24 mpg instead of 12 mpg. Second, gasoline prices are soaring; when you subtract taxes, the raw gasoline price has jumped 75 or 80 per cent this year, which means someone is ripping us off good. Third, we're no longer falling for the Madison Avenue line that equates the luxury car with success, status and sexual prowess.

About a year ago, while visiting the Chevy spring and bumper plant in Livonia, I saw a GM film aimed at employees, viewing with alarm the increasing number of imported autos on American roads. Again, there were subtle sneers at small cars combined with the overt theme of "Buy American."

The GM film warned, as I recall, that every one per cent increase of foreign car sales meant a loss of 20,000 jobs in American auto plants.

So what has happened since then? Let us go back to the auto industry apologist writing in the

metropolitan daily. At the bottom of his long, grey article is the fact that in the first seven months of 1973, foreign cars captured 16.1 per cent of the American market compared to 14.9 per cent in the same period last year. The increase is 1.2 per cent.

In terms of jobs, that's 24,000 paychecks being written to Toyota, Volkswagen and Volvo workers instead of to American workers.

On the other hand, the unnamed sources quoted by Bob Irvin, automotive writer for the Detroit News, simply say vaguely that "thousands" of jobs will be lost if government pressures the sacred auto industry into producing more small cars.

The truth of the matter is that the American worker will be worse off if the Big Four DON'T compete successfully with the Bugs produced by foreign car manufacturers. Even though American manufacturers will produce small cars when government and the consumers demand them, the auto executives can't stop sneering at the one-ton, 25 mpg car.

Meanwhile, imported cars continue to worsen the U.S. balance of payments and contribute to our ruinous inflation.

There's no use appealing to the auto executives' concern for the environment in persuading them to produce small cars, because they don't instinctively care about the environment.

There's no use appealing to their patriotism to correct the balance of payments by getting them truly to compete with VW instead of bad-mouthing it.

There's no sense appealing to the auto executives to worry about American workers' jobs, and to create more jobs by selling more small cars. The auto execs' bonuses, again, are based on rev-

enues and profits, not the number of persons employed.

The solution is to make it economically worthwhile for auto industry management to produce small cars. How? The boards of directors could do it by (a) making bonuses largely dependent on


reducing foreign companies' shares of the American market and (b) making bonuses partially dependent on sheer numbers of cars sold rather than dollar revenues or dollar profits.

We no longer live on the cowboy's open range, where we can burn up unlimited supplies of iron

and petroleum driving gas - guzzling dinosaurs.

Rather, we live on a space ship with limited resources. It is our patriotic duty, as well as our sacred duty to generations unborn, to cut in half the size of the cars we buy and the amount of fossil fuel we burn.

Don't Become A Casualty Of Holiday Weekend Traffic

Battle lines are forming for the start of the largest traffic fight of the year. This is the one between those who follow the safety rules and those speed demons who always appear during the traditional three-day Labor Day holiday.

It's the annual duel between those who want to get to their summer homes, to resorts and to play spots for the final time of the season and those reckless drivers who can't wait to get to their destination and then delay until the latest possible moment to start home. That means speeding like demons without regard to safety or fellow drivers and usually results in the year's largest highway toll in the 72-hour period.

Annually warnings of all kinds are issued prior to the start of the Labor Day holiday. Motorists are told where the detours are; they are told to follow all rules of safety, told to drive carefully and get to the destination, not in a hospital or funeral home, but there are always those who won't heed advice. The result a year ago was a death toll of 33.

It could be even higher this year since the weatherman has promised humid but perfect weather. That means more and more will throw caution to the winds and drive faster and faster to get to the summer resort as quickly as possible to relax for the final time of the season.

It makes no difference whether the AAA and the Michigan State Police tell of the dangers of fast driving or not. Some listen but a good many don't.

There are those who keep well within the speed limits, take their time and have a safe trip. But there are others who whip around curves with tires squealing, zip in and out of traffic, scaring their passengers as well as those in every car they pass. They are the ones the State Police will be looking for, hopeful they can get the car off the road before one of those horrendous, life-taking accidents.

In the past 10 years, Michigan has had an average of 33 highway deaths over the three-day holiday. The high was 51 in 1968, and the low toll was 24 recorded in 1971.

"We would hope to keep the death toll down this year with an intensified drive for safe driving,"

says Col. John R. Plants, head of the Michigan State Police. "We urge all Michigan residents and visitors to use extra care in all their holiday activities to lessen the rash of accidents."

"Normal precautions should include using safety belts in cars and life preservers in boats."

Col. Plants warned against drinking while driving, stressing that a majority of the holiday accidents are caused by such motorists.

"If you have to drink because it's the last big holiday of the year, then turn the wheel over to someone else. It's much better to arrive and enjoy yourself than to overdo and wind up in a hospital bed or a casket."

The State Police will begin operations at noon Friday and continue through midnight Monday. Maximum coverage will be provided from 3 to 9 p.m. daily during the weekend. Special attention will be devoted to highway sections having had bad accident experience.

The State Highway Commission is doing its part to make the highways safer during the three days by ordering suspension of all road and bridge construction work.

The order, effective Friday at 5 p.m. until 8 a.m. Tuesday, halts all but emergency or specially authorized work that does not affect traffic.

In addition, all construction sites will be put in condition to handle anticipated heavy volume of weekend traffic, and a check of all signs on detours and construction areas will be made for conformance with signing and safety precautions.

Preliminary predictions for the weekend show motorists will drive an estimated 651 million miles between noon Friday and noon Tuesday. That's two per cent more than the 638 million vehicle miles logged by drivers over the 1972 holiday.

Northbound traffic is expected to be heavy Friday from 2 p.m. to 10 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Southbound return traffic is expected to be heaviest on Monday from 2 p.m. to 9 p.m.

There's some good news for the weekend. Motorists should have no serious trouble obtaining gasoline. Should a Service Station

Dealers Association of Michigan rumored strike materialize, 20 per cent of the state's service stations could close.

However, closures would be primarily concentrated in southern Michigan urban centers if a boycott is in fact called.

The following advice comes from the Auto Club:

To minimize problems purchasing gasoline at night and all day Sunday and Monday, motorists should travel on the top half of their tanks.

If seeking hotel and motel accommodations in popular resort areas, travelers should make advance reservations. Most roadside facilities should have vacancies.

Campers seeking space in state park campgrounds should start their Labor Day trips early since many facilities fill the night before a holiday weekend begins. Campers should select alternate destinations in case the first choice is filled upon arrival.

Motorists should expect some traffic slowdowns on I-75 around Flint due to a 21 mile long road widening project. It runs from the merging point of I-75 and US-23 to Birch Run.

Don't become a member of the battalion of "get there faster" fighters. Drive carefully, follow all traffic rules, and get home safely. It's better to be able to read about the road fatalities than to be listed among them.

2 Years Have Passed

Yes, time passes slowly in the mountains. But in Observerland territory, I for one am acutely aware 1976 is only three years away; 1984, only 11. More than a movie, 2001 brings the stark realization that today's newly born will have their 28th birthday then. Man, the time-binder is ever seeking perspective on his own history.

I wish to differ with those who opined that the Watergate hearings have no place in the American system of jurisprudence. Eagerly listening to the Senate's proceedings at every opportunity, I felt I was part of my own government searching for the truth.

More than once I thought of my experiences last summer as a Wayne County Circuit Court juror and reflected upon Watergate as giving opportunity to my fellow Americans to directly participate as "a member of the jury." A free and open press at a public hearing is, indeed, the best guarantee that government leaders who have lost their way will not go undetected.

But beyond the polarization of Americans into two groups of those for court proceedings and those for open hearings on TV I feel a need to inquire into my own ethics, values, and philosophy.

With the summer fading into fall, I become aware my life can only be led one day at a time and the problem is still effective living and growth of my self. How to get myself together is a task uniquely my own, Watergate or no.

Since July 27, 1971 I've been studying a little book, American Government (available from the Center for Health Education, 4421 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, 48201), in which John M. Dorsey, a great man of our area and our time, provides clear thinking for every citizen who would see his health in direct relationship to his government.

As I have done, readers of the Observer papers may find consciousness of their own self sovereignty in reading (authoring) Dorsey's Declaration of Conscious Independence:

"I, including my every fellow-man, am born, live all of my life, and die, one only but entirely self contained individual. All I can ever really be 'lonesome for' is my appreciation for my united wholeness. I can never really be at a loss except for my recognition of my complete and intact fullness.

"My life provides my only possible reality. My inability to see my personal identity in any of my world is traceable to my need to sleep through it. My acknowledging my personal identity in any of my living is traceable to my arousing myself to be wide awake to it. I can never 'have' anything; I must always be everything.

"My only possible consciousness is self consciousness; my only possible unconsciousness is self unconsciousness. My vicissitudes is the condition of my self love create controls directing my being. My only possible governing power is acknowledgeable or unacknowledgeable self sovereignty.

"My insight regarding my absolute autonomy is the consequence of my willingly waking up sufficiently to be able to call my soul my own and my all my soul."

And so I (we) see that the government is mine (ours).

75 Watch Murder, None Offers Aid

Why didn't somebody stop them?

That question has been raised a hundred times since a 19-year-old man was literally kicked and beaten to death in a Plymouth Township restaurant as some 75 persons watched.

While three persons have been arrested in connection with the death, the question of why it was allowed to happen still remains.

An employee of the restaurant who was working at the time said it happened so quickly, no one was able to aid the man.

In light of the sheriff's report that deputies were arriving as one of the alleged assailants was fleeing, this seems highly unlikely.

What seems more plausible is the all-too-common attitude in such situations:

Nobody wanted to get involved. This was not an instance

where the assailants displayed dangerous weapons, but rather they stomped the man and hit him with a ketchup bottle.

Why couldn't any one - or several - of the diners and employees have distracted the assailants' attention either by directly interfering or by throwing something at them?

Certainly any dozen people in the restaurant could have subdued the assailants.

Editorials decrying the "I don't want to get involved" attitude have become all too common in today's world, but perhaps no one thinks that could happen here. It did.

While the assailants are not blameless, neither are the 75 persons who watched when even a slight action on their part may well have saved a man's life.



Sub Teacher Tells Job Grief

EDITOR:

I am 25 years old, married, a resident of Plymouth since 1955, a teacher and unemployed. For two years I have been trying to get a job with the Plymouth School District and for two years they have, instead, been hiring other people from Ypsilanti, Detroit and who-knows-where.

I feel that it is a sad situation when school officials refuse to hire someone who has lived here most of his life, like myself, and instead hire people from outside of Plymouth who have very little, if any, knowledge of what this community is about.

I was told that if I became a substitute teacher that I would stand a much better chance of getting a permanent job. So I became one. Three semesters later I am no closer to getting a permanent job than I was 1½ years ago. So much for subbing.

Many young people like myself are forced into becoming substitute teachers or are faced with the alternative of leaving the profession. But what is even worse is that as a substitute I had occasion to work on the average of one to two days a week at most, and on several occasions weeks would go by where I would not work at all.

The reason was that most of the subbing assignments were filled with old ladies in their 40s, 50s and 60s who would be better off at home, so that more subbing jobs would at least be available for young husbands like my-

self who have to support a family.

Because of this situation, I refuse to be a substitute any longer. Bills don't get paid when you are not working and you don't work when (1) as a substitute your job is being given to women who really don't have to work, and (2) as a teacher your job goes to outsiders instead of residents of the community like myself, whose credentials are just as good as anyone's.

For the third September in a row I am going without a permanent job in this school district. Consequently I am going to have to leave the profession for which I was trained and look for work elsewhere.

I feel that this letter expresses adequately, if briefly, the frustration and bitterness that I feel after seeing for the third year in a row potential teaching jobs going to non-residents of the community. I think that I also speak for many other unemployed male teachers like myself, who have families to support, and who cannot find jobs in their own home towns.



New Record SC Enrollment

By JAN WILLIAMS

Schoolcraft College will have an all-time record enrollment this fall, according to Edward V. McNally, vice president for student affairs.

As of last Friday, enrollment was 6,150 compared to the former record of 6,017 in the fall of 1971. Last fall the enrollment was 5,948.

McNally said the enrollment figure can still be affected until the end of the drop-add period, Sept. 4. The present figure also doesn't

include community service program enrollment, which is expected to add about 1,500.

McNally also reported 450 are presently registered for classes in Garden City.

The college's projected budget is based on 54,000 credit hours for the school year. McNally said credit hours presently amount to 52,000. He said the additional 1,200 plus credit hours is expected to come from Community Services.

College Gets \$5,000 In Gifts

Gifts of \$5,000 have been accepted for Schoolcraft College by its board of trustees.

Approximately \$4,000 worth of electronic testing equipment was donated by the Burroughs Corp., Plant in Plymouth.

It was reported that some of the equipment is new and some is in need of repair which can be done with the college's own equipment.

The Engineering Development Center of Diamond Automation, Inc., Detroit, donated approximately 700 pounds of electrical and electronic components to be used by the college electronics department.

The estimated value of this equipment, which consists of switches, transistors, etc., is \$1,000.

SC Prefers June Election

The Schoolcraft College board of trustees has unanimously voted to support June elections for school affairs rather than switch to a November date.

The decision at the Aug. 22 meeting was based primarily on the impracticality of a change in election dates at this time.

In a recent study session, board members said the college would be forced to bear all election costs as well as coordination of November elections held in parts of the college district where regular fall elections were not scheduled. The college shares June election costs with K-12 school districts.

The Schoolcraft district takes in five school districts in three counties as well as

One of the joys of an antique show is the anticipation of seeing what your favorite dealers have acquired in the months of foraging since last year's show.

The Plymouth Symphony League antique mart is a highlight of the city's Fall Festival - the annual four-day winding on the weekend following Labor Day.

Dealers always save special items for the Plymouth show. With the help of Mrs. Harold Guenther, dealer chairman, we were able to contact several of them and discover just what they "have in store."


The Morrisons, Ruby and

George of Union Lake, haven't missed a Plymouth show. When asked what "goodies" could be expected this year in their Red Sled booth, Mrs. Morrison had an intriguing list.

"There's a tall, narrow chimney cupboard with a pierced tin door (it's pine); an old wash bench; grain bins that make good fireplace wood holders; and a stenciled churn, just the right height for an end table."

"We have lots of old baskets and a pine round-top table. And if they're ready, five arrow back chairs."

She went on to explain that only one of the chairs had been left in its original state with stencils on the back.



Someone had painted the other four a "horrible green." These four have been stripped down and the Morrisons hope to have them ready for the show. Irene McNamara, in-

imitable Ann Arbor dealer, told us bronze figurines are a "hot item" now. She will have a figure of a very young boy. She believes it is of French origin and is signed "Picciole."

Mrs. McNamara will have round Shaker boxes, a 62-inch string of cherry amber beads which came from a Boston estate; a quilt appliqued with circles of flowers in old shades of reds

and greens; and a painting on velvet that dates from the early 1900s.

"I'm going to have an all-wood grain shovel," she added, "made out of a single piece of wood. This is only the third one I've ever found. I had one 10 years ago, one three years ago and now this one."

Jean Magee of Clinton is planning on including a pine kitchen cupboard and a pine kitchen table, both dating back to the 1840s, in her country furniture booth.

Viola Borgert said lavallieres are big with the young people - diamonds, opals or pearl drops - suspended on very fine gold chains. According to the jewelry

dealers, cameos are making a comeback. Opal rings and garnets still are very much in demand. Bangle bracelets and Indian jewelry are in fashion.

Mrs. Borgert has 100 friends who are collecting old baby rings to be made into bracelets.

A pair of twin dolls made in the 1890s will be the center of interest in Ruth Holly's booth. The bisque dolls are of German make and are about 24 inches tall. The former owner requested that they never be sold separately.

Miss Holly, a Plymouth dealer, specializes in antique dolls and will have a variety of bisque, china and other types.

Mrs. Guenther has signed contracts with 23 dealers and auxiliary dealers Richard Wells and Lois Mitchell for the mart. Each has been chosen for a special interest and the result is a well-rounded variety of collector's items.

The three-day mart runs Sept. 7 to 9 in the Plymouth Cultural Center at Farmer and Theodore St. Friday and Saturday hours are noon until 9 p.m. On Sunday the show opens at noon and closes at 7 p.m.

Free parking is ample and refreshments are available. Admission charge is \$1 and the proceeds go to support the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra.

Can Be Costly Game

Dealers: How They Get Started

What makes an antique dealer?

You see them in their booths at the shows surrounded by their wares. They are pleasant, protective and obviously fond of their possessions.

The sheer drudgery of hauling all those precious old pieces to the show takes the muscle of a furniture mover and the tender care of a mother. The move out, at the end of the show, looms ahead.

In a poor show a dealer's sales could be a mere \$18 - for five days of labor. They have spent more on the rent for the booth and much more for the new items acquired during the show.

How and why do they do it?

There is a common denominator in all dealers. They are collectors.

For many it follows a pattern.

It starts with a collection. The collector wants to be more discriminate, decides to upgrade the quality.

So he begins to trade. He will give up four or five pieces for one new acquisition.

Somewhere along the line it becomes an exciting game.

He has to buy a whole estate to acquire one coveted item. Things have begun to accumulate.

For the housewife, her little hobby can get out of hand. Not only is storage space a problem, she can spend more money than she

cares to admit.

And so a dealer is born.

Clydie Meyers, that grand old dean of them all whose big white house on Canton Center Rd. was a joy to so many antiquers, used to warn her friends:

"Don't be a collector. Collections are a burden. Choose the best of a period. Don't buy every salt and pepper shaker you can put your hands on. Be selective; buy only Benningtons."

Like many other dealers,

"Clydie" was unhappy about selling to people she didn't like or who didn't appreciate what they were buying. It is difficult to "let go" of some items.

For the dealers, the antique shows have almost a club-like flavor. They meet old friends with the same interests. It becomes a part of their social life.

Whether it's a \$1,000 show or an \$18 one, the excitement is there.

It's all part of the game.

Nonfat Dry Milk

One Man's Battle

By LORAIN McCLISH

Nonfat dry milk costs one-half that of fluid milk.

A family of four which consumes an average of three quarts of milk per day can save between \$200 and \$250 annually on food bills with a switch to dry milk.

Nonfat dry milk contains no butterfat or cholesterol.

The product is a popular one for diet conscious people.

"In fact, nonfat dry milk is probably the best bargain on the supermarket shelf today," says Leon Sanna,

who shuffles through news clippings and testimonial letters from nutritionists to prove his point. "The nation's consumers are finally discovering us," he says.

Sanna is president of the Sanna Division of Beatrice Foods, whose major product is Sanalac. He is in the Detroit area this week waging his continuing one-man acceptance war against a dry milk stigma held tenaciously by many Americans.

Sanna's war is waged against hang-ups that came out of World War II "when millions of soldiers came home vowing they would never again touch powdered milk (or powdered eggs or spam). And who could argue when it didn't taste good and it wouldn't dissolve? Yet new drying processes changed that years ago."

Another stigma stemmed from dry milk's association as a welfare food in the early 1930s. "Many people just

won't believe that anything given away, or anything that can be purchased so cheap, can be good."

He backs up his claim of "good" and "best buy on the supermarket shelf" by comparing the cost of protein in nonfat dry milk with the cost of other protein sources.

Round steak, one of the best meat buys because there is little waste, costs about \$5 a pound of protein. The protein in Sanalac costs about \$2 a pound. According to Sanna, round steak is the cheapest popular source of protein next to milk.

He has statistics to show that milk consumption in America has been steadily decreasing for the past 15 years while at the same time medical studies show a correlating increase of calcium deficiency diseases and teeth and gum problems.

reluctant to try it, go half and half with whole milk for a while, easing off on the whole milk until they are converted. In a while, whole milk will taste like cream to them and I guarantee you, they will ask for the nonfat product."

He stresses the importance of mixing the product at least four hours before use to allow the proteins to properly rehydrate.

"All milk should be ice cold for best flavor," he says. "Other than that, you are getting exactly the same product as when you buy liquid milk except that there is no butterfat, no cholesterol, more protein, and a lower cost."

The milk drying process for Sanalac comes from a patent held by Sanna's father and involves separating milk proteins from skim milk. The company also created an instant cocoa mix, and produces coffee creamers, puddings, natural frozen whipped cream and related dairy items.

"Only in the past year has there been a slight upswing to this pattern," he says. "Maybe our emphasis on nutritional information is doing some good. We know the average American is getting only half of the calcium he needs, and milk is our best source of calcium."

Continuing with the benefits of purchasing a dry milk product, Sanna says, "Few people realize that it is a convenience food and a lot easier to carry home than the equivalent amount of fluid milk."

"A two-pound box, for example, makes two and one-half gallons of milk, whereas that volume of fluid milk weighs more than 22 pounds. In addition, with nonfat dry milk you don't have to buy milk so often and it doesn't take up so much space."

He has a few suggestions for new users of nonfat dry milk. "If your children are





Down Home Food, Shaker Style

By ELLY

We returned to Shaker-town, Ky., earlier this month.

It had been three years since our last visit to the Pleasant Hill community and the magic was still there.

Once installed in our room in the Trustees House with the simple Shaker furnishings, the handloomed rugs,

bedspreads and curtains, the change took place. We settled into the pace of 19th century living.

A horse-drawn cart ambled down the graveled main street.

Later we discovered the mare's name was Marie Darnley. She was in foal and was spending the summer as a lady of leisure in the Shaker

village. Sometimes, her driver told us, Marie forgot her "delicate condition" and took off at a wild pace. She is really a standardbred and has done many a turn around harness racing tracks.

The Shakers were noted for their bountiful table. Weary travelers, visitors and even, during the Civil War, hundreds of troops gave glowing accounts of the meals served by the Shaker sisters.

Today, Mrs. Elizabeth Kremer maintains the high standards set by the kitchen deaconesses in the 19th century.

If you would like to try your hand at some Shaker cooking, there are several cookbooks available.

"We Make You Kindly Welcome" is a charming little book written by Mrs. Kremer and published by the Keystone Printery in Lexington, Ky. Caroline B. Piercy's "Not by Bread Alone" published by Crown Publishers, Inc. is also recommended.

CHESS PIE

1½ c. all-purpose flour
½ t. salt
2/3 c. shortening
Combine flour and salt in mixing bowl; cut in shortening until mixture resembles small peas. Sprinkle in three

to four tablespoons of water to make a stiff dough, stirring with fork. Do not knead. Roll out on floured board. Roll into circle one inch larger than nine-inch pie plate. Fit into pie plate; flute edge.

FILLING

3 eggs
1 T. cornmeal
1/8 t. mace
1½ c. sugar
¼ c. melted butter or margarine
1 T. cider vinegar
1 t. vanilla

Beat eggs slightly. Combine cornmeal, mace and sugar; stir in eggs. Stir in remaining ingredients; mix well. Pour into pie shell. Bake at 325 degrees for one hour or until firm and brown.

COUNTRY CLUB CHESS PIE

1 stick butter
2½ c. sugar

¼ c. grated Velveeta
4 eggs
1 t. vanilla
1 unbaked 9-inch pie shell
Cream butter and sugar. Add cheese, mix well. Beat in eggs one at a time, and vanilla. Pour into pie shell. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 50 to 60 minutes.

OHIO LEMON PIE

2 lemons
2 c. sugar
Pastry for 2 crusts
4 eggs

This is yet another very old lemon pie recipe which the early Ohio Shakers fashioned frequently. "Slice two lemons as thin as paper, rip and all. Place them in a bowl (it states yellow bowl) and pour over them two cups of sugar. Mix well and let stand for better than two hours. Then go about making your best pastry for two crusts. Line a pie dish with same. Beat four eggs together and pour over lemons.

Fill unbaked pie shell with this and add top crust with small vents cut in to let out steam. Place in a hot oven at 450 degrees for 15 minutes and then cut down heat and bake until a silver knife inserted into custard comes out clean. From "Not by Bread Alone," Shaker Cook Book.
