Deputies Union Ad Had Gall

No doubt many of our Plymouth Township readers think the National Union of Police Officers Wayne County Sheriff's Local 502 has a lot of gall to run the full-page advertisement which appeared in Wednesday's Plymouth Mail & Observer.

The ad asked Plymouth Township residents to vote "yes" on the advisory question on Tuesday's ballot which asks, "Are you satis-



Anyone who has been in that situation can tell you such is not the case. Point number four in the ad says the Sheriff's Youth Bureau "provides protection for your children at school and at play."

Then how come they've never been in Plymouth schools? The youth programs here are run by the City of Plymouth police and the State Police.

Perhaps it is Tuesday's election that prompted the sheriff to deploy what appears to be the highest number of motorcycle and patrol cars ever noticed in the township since Thursday.

Add to the above points against the road patrol, the uncooperativeness of supplying the barest details to the press which is trying to inform the people of the crime situation in their community.

I would venture to say that if Plymouth Township residents cast votes saying they're satisfied with the present police protection in the township, it's because of the State Police, not the Wayne County Sheriff's Road Patrol.

If they vote that they're dissatisfied with the police protection and the township board decides to establish its own police force, all the

Wayne County Sheriff deputies who've been asking around township hall about the possibility of being police chief will come running up with their tails wagging.

fied with the present police protection provided to the township of Plymouth?"

One wonders why the union chose to run the ad. The only logical answer is the chance that if township residents vote "no" on the issue, the township board will investigate other means of providing law enforcement in the community.

Maybe some sheriff deputies would lose their jobs. Did the sheriff deputies' union run the ad because it felt the road patrol's effectiveness was in question and it necessitated a little arm twisting?

Let's take the points made -- and those obviously omitted.

First and foremost, nowhere does it mention the threatened end of the sheriff's road patrol to Wayne County townships -- although state law requires the county sheriff to provide protection to unincorporated areas.

In fact the ad says, "A yes vote on (the) advisory question would mean citizens and homeowners want the continuation of police services from the Wayne County Sheriff's Department; at no increase in property taxes to you the voter."

And therein lies the rub. The Wayne County Board of Commissioners has been discussing a proposal to force townships to seek additional millage to finance the existing road patrol level or start their own local police departments.

The sheriff deputies' ad happens to overlook that. It also happens to overlook the fact (reported elsewhere in a story in today's paper) that the Michigan State Police -- who are not bound by law to provide police protection for townships -- are as effective (or nearly so) as the road patrol in Plymouth Township.

The State Police subpost on Mill Street has provided a higher concentration of police in the township than the sheriff.

But the State Police will be moving to a new facility being built in Northville Township, and while it won't discontinue patrolling the township, some decline in its influence may be felt.

This would increase township residents' reliance on the road patrol.

The ad listed eight points which supposedly are there to convince township voters they can't do without the road patrol.

Let's take the third point, for example. It says, "The Sheriff's Department employs a full-time narcotics unit to keep drugs out of Plymouth Township and its schools."

What that implies -- the sheriff has a separate anti-drug unit stationed in Plymouth Township fulltime -- is not true. That unit services several other communities as well and is often tied up.

The ad also says services provided by the road patrol are supplemented by a staff of 187 professionally trained sheriff's personnel which (sic) are always on call and deployed immediately in case of riot, natural disasters or on any other occasion where it is of the utmost importance to have a large number of trained personnel on the scene.

This implies that when you return home from the weekend to find your house has been burglarized, one quick call to the sheriff will produce two dozen Columbus-type-officers who'll dust everything for finger prints to track down the thief.
