A new event added to tonight's entertainment lineup is square dancing on Main Street in front of city hall from 7:30 to 10 p.m.

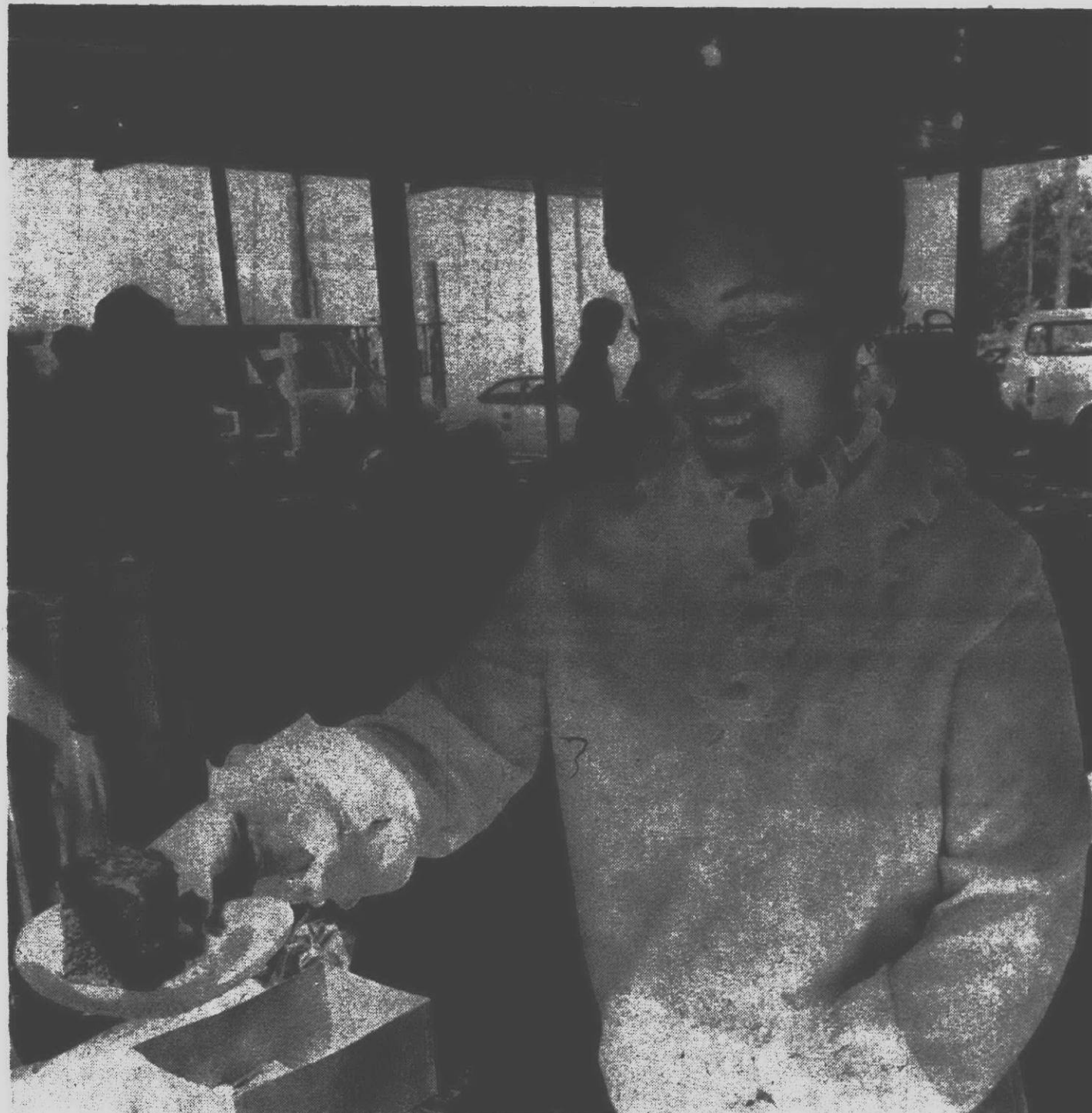
Sunday's events center around the Rotary Club's famous chicken barbecue from noon to 6 p.m.

'911' Emergency Phone Number Hits Hurdles

Because Michigan Bell Telephone Co. has let exchanges straddle local governmental boundaries, hopes for a "911" emergency telephone number in the Plymouth community may be smothered.

For several years, police and fire officials have discussed a "911" system. Prime roadblock appears to be the sheer number of small local governments lumped under one exchange which would

have to work together to make it a success.

Detroit and Southfield are among the few areas which have adopted the system. Under it, a person can dial 911 for emergency police, fire or medical aid. The call goes to a central switchboard where an operator dispatches the appropriate police, fire or ambulance service.

Officials in the Plymouth area would like to establish a similar service, but they have encountered technical and financial problems.

The problems are compounded by the geographic area utilizing the telephone exchanges of 453, 455 and 459. A person dialing from a telephone with any of these exchanges could be residing in the city or township of Plymouth or sections of Superior, Canton, Salem or Northville Townships.

Each of these areas is served by separate police and fire departments. Thus, if the "911" system were implemented today, its effectiveness would depend on the

operator dispatching the right service to the emergency, according to Plymouth Police Chief Timothy Ford.

Plymouth Township Fire Chief James Gignac, Canton Township Fire Chief Mel Paulun and Ford agree that the major problem is getting all the governmental units together to help establish and finance the system.

Although an approximate cost for starting the system

Bubbles in the Tartan Floor of Plymouth-Salem High School's gymnasium have prompted a second round of negotiations with the school's general contractor in an attempt to get the floor repaired before the warranty expires in November.

tractor J.A. Ferguson Company when it bubbled shortly after it was installed. It had been in use less than a year when more bubbles appeared again on the surface last month.

Melvin Blunk, retiring assistant superintendent of business, said the district is attempting to have the floor repaired to satisfaction before the warranty expires Nov. 13. He added that the district holds a \$50,000 bond from Ferguson assuring satisfactory repairs.

But Trustee George Lawton and Supt. John M. Hoben both said there had been no attempt to form a group bargaining position. Lawton represented Plymouth on the task force last year.

"There is no mandate from this group. The meetings are very informal and it's mostly an exchange of information," Hoben said. Lawton added it "was no threat to the bargaining process."

The trustees voted 6-1 to appoint Penar, with Mirto voting no.

In related action, the board: •Delayed action on naming representatives to the Plymouth Area Economic Expansion Commission. There has been some speculation that the board would pull out of the group due to budget cutbacks.

•Ordered Board President Dr. E.J. McClendon to appoint the necessary delegates to the Michigan Association of School Boards' convention coming up in October.

"It appears to me that the bubbles in this case, are the fault of the sub-floor, not the Tartan Floor," Blunk said. He theorized that water or air pressure below the floor formed pressure spots and caused the Tartan surface to bubble.

The Tartan surface is "glued" to the four-inch thick concrete floor. Below the concrete, is an open space where some type of pressure apparently is forming and has no other escape than to seep through the concrete and cause the Tartan to bubble.

After two letters to the Farmington-based contractor, a meeting was held last week between school officials, the contractor and architects of the school.

Alexander Ferguson, owner of the contracting firm, agreed to put vents into the area below the concrete and attempt to release the water or air pressure into tunnels running below the school.

If this relieves the pressure, the floor will be repaired and accepted by the district. If it doesn't work, Blunk speculated that, as a "last resort," a wood floor will be installed on top of the tartan.

When the school was designed, a Tartan Floor was recommended by the athletic department and school district, Blunk said. The advantages of a Tartan surface are that it provides a little cushion and that it is "very, very durable" and can be used for a variety of activities, he said.

It was installed by Bauer-Foster Floors Inc. of Detroit, "one of the largest flooring companies around with a fine reputation," Blunk said.

When the first, and much

larger, bubbles appeared last year, Ferguson had the floor replaced by Bauer-Foster at Ferguson's expense of approximately \$20,000.

Most of the more than 30 bubbles and "imperfections" which were recently found in the floor aren't visible without close scrutiny.

But Blunk said the bubbles are signs that the floor is beginning to deteriorate.

"We indicated to the architect that we want a floor that will last at least five to 10 years," he said.

Blunk's first letter to Ferguson dated July 20 didn't evoke a response from the contractor. A second letter in August included a copy of the \$50,000 bond and led to the meeting where possible solutions to the problem were discussed.

In his first letter, Blunk stated that a school district report indicated that "the floor appears to be in a state

Blunk said that the floor will be usable when school starts until the repairs are made.

is not available, it could conceivably run into millions of dollars. Detroit's system cost between \$6 and \$7 million, and it has the advantage of one police and fire department and telephone exchanges which are mostly restricted to the city boundaries.

The Plymouth exchange's geographic area involved includes six fire departments, two police departments, the county and state since State Police and two sheriff's patrols would be involved, Gignac said.

The departments would have to forfeit some of their own identity because they would give up their own dispatchers in favor of a central dispatcher, he added.

"We discussed it as long as five years ago, and the problem we confronted is the number of areas involved," he said. "I'm 100 per cent for it, but how do you do it unless you have a magic fairy with a little wand to tap somebody on the head?"

Ford said the system "requires an operator knowl-

edgeable enough in the geographic area who can vector the right service. That's the problem."

He said a feasible system could be one where Livonia forms the core and the Plymouth area is a satellite system.

"I don't know who'd pay for it," he added.

Although federal funding is available for the system, local units would have to cover

a portion of the costs.

Paulun, who is president of the Western Wayne County Mutual Aid Assn., said the organization has discussed the "911" system and agrees that it is feasible.

"But it would take a lot of agreement between the municipalities," he said. "I think it is a good idea if it can be worked out."

"But who's going to pay for it?"

Festival Volunteers Pitch In To Help 100 Good Causes

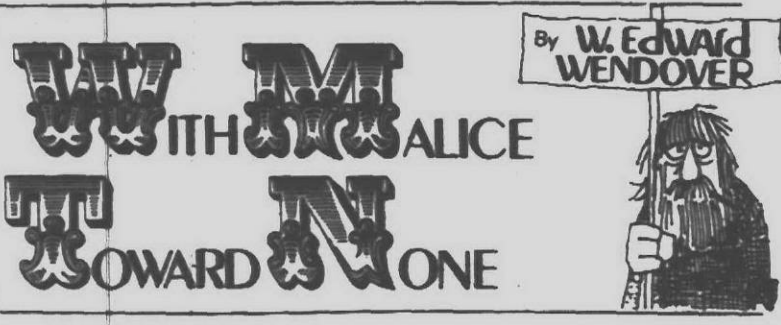
It's great to see so many people having a good time. That's the most obvious facet of the Plymouth Fall Festival.

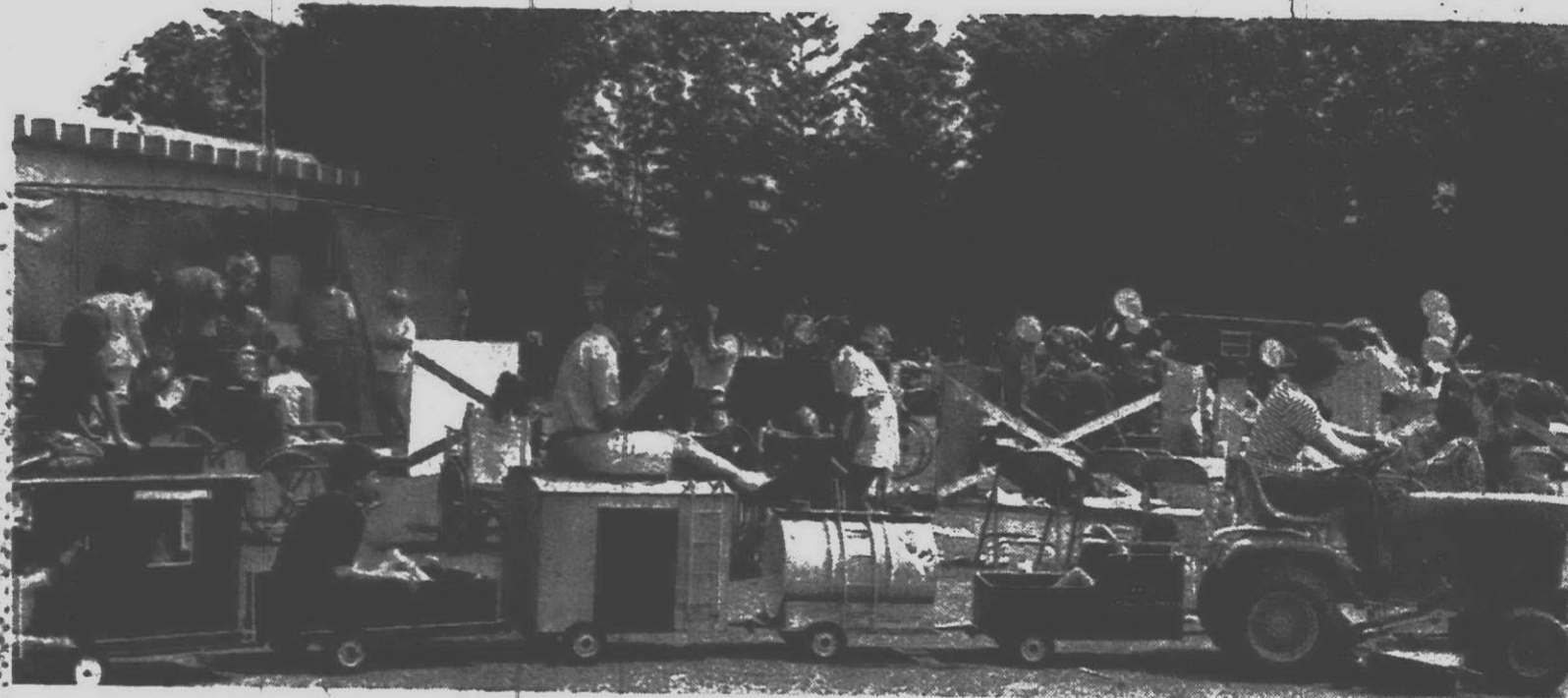

Adventures Of Jim Hill

Shipwreck, Earthquake And Weirdos

What do you do when you're young, single, restless, and have a few bucks to spare?

Why, bum half way around the world, of course.

Take it from Jim Hill of 8861 Virgil, Redford Township. He did just that for seven months beginning last November.

From Redford to Australia and back again, the 1970 Thurston grad hitchhiked, scrounged, survived a shipwreck, slept in a Fijian village, and met a lot of weirdos along the way.

And that's not even the half of it.

Sparked by a boyhood desire to visit Australia and dissatisfaction with life at Michigan State University, Hill, 20, dropped out last year. He then started planning to make his dream come true.

"Being so restless, I just wanted to travel," said the 6-1, 180 pounder, who wears his hair moderately long. "Australia has always been sort of an obsession with me."

"When I was going to the university," he related, "I could see I wasn't really interested in anything there, so I figured I'd go earn some money and travel."

And travel he did. Working on a tugboat in the Detroit River last year, Hill scraped up enough coins to launch his lengthy sojourn.

The entire trip cost \$1,500, he estimated - about \$1,000 for travel and \$500 for living expenses.

Though the money he'd saved was not enough, he found he could work overseas and make do with basics.

With a backpack and about 46 pounds of gear, Hill made his move last November, leaving Redford's icy winter behind for the pleasures and rigors of the South Pacific.

Striking a deal with a new car dealer, he drove a late model auto cross country to Los Angeles, taking US 66 through the deep South.

"I was just lucky," he commented. "The dealer had a lot of cars he wanted driven out in the winter, so I grabbed at the chance."

The trip across the country, however, was by no means a snap, he said. There were dust, blizzards, and "an awful lot of snow" before he arrived in sunny southern California.

After delivering the car, Hill set about traversing the Pacific in style. "I had all my hopes on taking a freighter," he said, but that idea fell through after he spent two weeks hitchhiking north to San Francisco and south to San Diego, searching in vain.

"There was a dock strike at the time," he said, "and I just couldn't find anything going out."

Finally, he boarded an Air New Zealand jetliner in Los Angeles and headed for Tahiti, in the middle of the Pacific, 17 degrees south of the equator.

Why Tahiti? "Well, I was allowed so many stops," he commented, and I'd heard a lot about it, so there I went."

There he spent about a week, before departing by cruiser for Tahiti's sister island of Moorea, which is rugged, mountainous, and sparsely inhabited.

Hill said he preferred the outlying areas best during his trip, and generally avoided cities.

"I just bummed around meeting people and tried to stay out of trouble," he laughed. "I went to a few bars in Tahiti and they were really rough."

Hill was somewhat disappointed by Tahiti, because it has become a tourist center and is quite commercialized.

"It seems like the culture has really dropped," he commented.

The rugged Moorea was more to his liking, though he found the natives a "bit arrogant."

"As I was hiking around the island, some would swear at me and others would be really friendly. Some will invite you in and offer you food."

Seeking the ultimate, he journeyed to the top of an ancient Moorean volcano where he slept for two days.

"It was a perfect view of the island," he said. "You could see the whole reef and it was sure better than any hotel."

Determined to probe further westward, however, he set out for New Zealand, where he spent 2½ months.

He hitchhiked up and down the north and south islands conversing with drivers along the way.

"The first thing that struck me when I got there," he said, "was that I was on the wrong side of the road."

That discovery brought another. Styles of hitchhiking vary all over.

Jerking his arm in all different directions, he demonstrated that while hitchhiking is universal, the signs aren't.

In fact, in some places, the American style can be insulting, he said.

Why hitchhike? "Well, I wanted to save money and meet the people," he said. And that brought new insights.

"Talking with the people who pick you up, you really learn a lot about your own country, too," he remarked. "They ask you a lot of things about your country, such as racism and Vietnam."

"I really learned a lot about the U.S."

He also said New Zealanders are probably the friendliest people he met.

Of the predominantly rural areas, he said, "Even people like old ladies will stop and pick you up. They think it's really great you've come to see their country. Many of them will even invite you in for tea."

Shunning the cities and their hotels, Hill chose to sleep out during most of his stay, using his sleeping bag.

"On my budget, you have to sleep out," he said. "That's where you save your money."

He found the rustic atmosphere pleasant, noting that many housewives still bake fresh bread each morning.

Thieves finally caught up with him, however, and he found himself with only 12 pounds of gear. Thieves got some of it, he sent some home, and then his tent fell apart.

"From then on I just slept under the stars," he added. "But I was lucky because it was pretty dry."

You've got to be careful, though," he pointed out. "In the islands, the authorities are pretty rough. If you want to sleep out, it's best to find a place to hide."

The police in Australia and New Zealand, however, are very friendly, he said. "In fact, they say if you need a place to sleep, you can come to the jail. They picked me up quite a few times hitchhiking," he said.

Then there was the night the big earthquake hit New Zealand while he was sleeping out.

"I just happened to wake up and all of a sudden I

heard a rumbling. I was miles away from anywhere.

"I jumped up and the ground started rolling," he recalled, learning later that the quake scored 6½ in the Richter scale.

"But I just figured there was nothing I could do about it," he said casually, "so I went right back to sleep. You just accept it."

"Actually, it's better than getting killed on a freeway," he laughed.

Though he toured Wellington, New Zealand's capital city, Hill was unimpressed.

"Cities are about the same all over the world," he said unenthusiastically.

Still more adventures were in store for the already seasoned traveler as he made his way to Australia. There he found a job and lived in old convict barracks built when Australia was a large British penal colony.

And he also found himself shipwrecked.

160-year-old building once used to house convicts when Australia was a giant penal colony.

"You've got to be creative," he laughed of the place, even though some of the locals said it was haunted.

"Then it was getting cold and I was ready for some nice warm weather," he said, so he left for Queensland, further north. Stopping in the city of Brisbane, he found himself broke again.

"Fortunately, I met some kids who taught me leatherwork and I did that for two weeks," he said, "making leather belts, watchbands, and so on."

With more pocket money and a desire to explore further north, he was off to Cairnes, where the country's main highway ends.

It was a long, rugged haul, he remembered. "A lot of days you just ache from being jostled around in those old trucks. And the roads are really bumpy."

But he enjoyed the area's tropical rain forest climate and rested about two weeks.

Swimming at area beaches took up a portion of his time, as Hill recalled sharks and underwater adventures off the reef surrounding the island.

Teaming up with several fellows who were snorkeling, he explored the underwaters. "You just lose yourself," he said, "but you really have to keep an eye out for the sharks. You can see them about 80 feet away."

He said it wasn't unusual to see two or three pass by each afternoon. Shark calls—or sirens—announce their presence to the unaware, he said.

While moseying around, he met a fellow with a yacht at Cairnes, and together they sailed south.

It was the vessel's first ocean voyage, he added, and after they'd sailed about 200 miles between the Barrier Reef and the coast, the ship ran aground, leaving them stranded.

A testy tide gave them problems trying to correct the situation, and finally the two parted company. Hill hitched his way back to Brisbane.

There he spent two days, hitched his way to Sydney, and decided it was time to head back home.

It wasn't without regrets, however. Recalling the Aus-

tralian girls, Hill remarked, "Well, actually, I think they're better than American girls. For one thing, they're not as marriage conscious, and they're really independent."

"They travel quite a bit—and they're lots of fun." How do the Australians like their beer?

"Boy, I thought Americans drank a lot of beer," he replied, "but their beer is 10 to 12 per cent alcohol."

"It's really powerful stuff and takes a while to get used to it."

In fact, in New Zealand he added, "they come with great big gasoline trucks and pump the beer into large tanks with hoses."

The trek home was no less uneventful. Stopping over at Fiji, he spent two days in a village hut.

"It was really different from Australia," he said. "Just another cultural shock."

"But it was a lot of fun. The natives eat a lot of plain food and drink quite a bit of Kava, a kind of alcohol."

"At times when they drink that, they get out their guitars, and it really turns into a wild situation!"

The only disappointment was the crass commercialism, he said. "In Fiji," he warned, "you've got to keep asking what their motives are."

Pushing eastward, he flew to Pago Pago in American Samoa, spent one day, and was off to Hawaii.

He stayed two weeks in a youth hostel in Honolulu, and sadly recalled the commercialism, the cold he caught, and the fact "my money was getting pretty low."

Hill then headed for San Francisco by jet where he renewed his relationship with the California "weirdos."

"There are a lot of really wild people there," he said. While hitchhiking to Seattle on the way home, he told of one fellow who picked him up.

"He told me about subterranean undernests a mountain and he was going up there to see them," Hill recalled. "He said they were flying saucer men - and he was dead serious."

Edging along US-101, he arrived in Seattle six days later. It was already June as he began hitchhiking non-stop across US-90 through the Rockies.

Sharing the driving with others, he ate at truck stops and made the trip home in 45 hours.

"That's just the way it turned out," he said. No mishaps, just straight through.

Seated in his carpeted bedroom with a giant map of the world posted on a wall, the seasoned traveler looked philosophically at the trip.

Recalling his university days, Hill said the trip meant more to him than staying in school.

"As far as education goes, all they ever did at MSU was assign books and I'd read them. Well, I can do that on my own," he said.

"I read plenty of books while I was travelling— besides learning about people, culture, even foreign politics. 'You learn the U.S. isn't the only one that has a lot of problems,'" he said.

Still proud of his own country, Hill remarked that the U.S. has the best roads anywhere.

But he was upset about the fast pace of life here compared to other countries.

"What I'd really like to see here is a slower pace and more enjoyment," he said. "Like other countries, we could still learn to live cheap, live well, have fun, and still get things done."

With a sensitivity for others, he recalled seeing many arrogant Americans overseas.

"Americans have a bad reputation as travellers," he said. "Like in Tahiti, I saw Americans demanding ham and eggs for breakfast."

"When you're in a foreign country," he added, "you just want to observe things—not disturb them. That's what I tried to do."

He'd seen crime, he said, but nowhere as bad as here. He'd also seen poverty, but none as bad as America's city slums.

Despite our own eyesores, he lauded the U.S. for its efforts to stem pollution. Other countries eventually must follow suit, he warned.

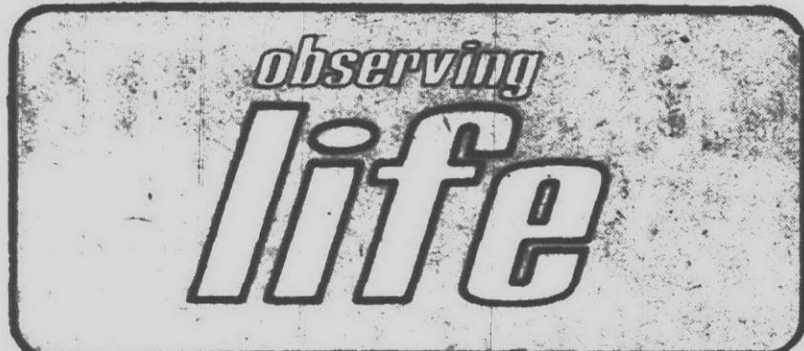
And what now? What do you do for an encore after all that?

"I'm going to earn a few dollars trying to paint some houses around here," he said. "Then I'll probably head down to Mexico in September and spend the winter there."

"These Michigan winters are murder!"

Churches Practice Sharing

"We're extending a helping hand to our brethren in Christ - because we share a common savior and a common witness," says Moderator Carl Signor of Mt. Hope Congregational Church of Livonia.

"It seems a miracle that we found this fine, welcoming church on the very first call," says The Rev. John Shahoub of St. Mary Antiochian Orthodox Church, moving into Livonia.

Both are talking about the newly-arranged plan that will allow both churches to share the Mt. Hope building at 30330 Schoolcraft.

Starting this Sunday, Sept. 9, the Mt. Hope congregation will gather in the sanctuary at 10 a.m. for a service with its minister, the Rev. Joseph Cimbara.

An hour later the Mt. Hope people will move to the fellowship hall for a coffee hour, and at 11:30 the sanctuary will be taken over by the orthodox congregation for its liturgical services.

It all came about because Father Shahoub and his congregation, organized in this area about a year ago, needed room for both services and a church school program.

"We had been using the St. Innocent Russian Orthodox Church in Redford Town-

ship," related Father.

"We were very pleased there - they were good to us," he added. But the problem was that there was no room to conduct a Christian education program.

The St. Mary congregation had purchased for \$56,000 a three-acre plot at 18100 Meriman and hired an architect to begin plans for a new sanctuary.

"But there have been delays," Father Shahoub said, "and the feeling was that the St. Mary families could not wait to begin the church school program."

The decision was to see if a large church in the area could share facilities until the new building could be built.

"And the very first church we called was Mt. Hope," the priest said. "They accepted us and I think it was a kind of a miracle. Maybe the Lord wills us to meet these good Christian people."

Rev. Cimbara said Mt. Hope's board of trustees and board of deacons recommended the plan, and then the congregation accepted it immediately.

"It's our policy to have our building used as much as possible," he added. "We already have a cooperative nursery and several other groups who meet here."

"To have another church share our facilities is just tremendous."



The Mt. Hope congregation is moving its worship hour up half an hour to accommodate the St. Mary congregation.

"We'll continue to hold our coffee hour in another part of the building while they use our sanctuary and classrooms," the pastor said. "We'll just have to keep a little quieter."

There also are preliminary plans for some joint endeavors by the two congregations, and possibly they will join in a service at Christmas.

No rent is being charged, Rev. Cimbara said, other than what the St. Mary congregation wants to offer as its share of expenses.

Father Shahoub, who turns 24 this weekend and is the youngest Antiochian Orthodox priest in the world, was eager to express the gratitude of his congregation.

"We are lucky to be in this situation to meet together and serve the Holy Eucharist

in this beautiful church," he said. "On behalf of my whole congregation, and that includes the older men and the little children, we thank and pray for Pastor Cimbara and the good Congregational Christians for this great opportunity."

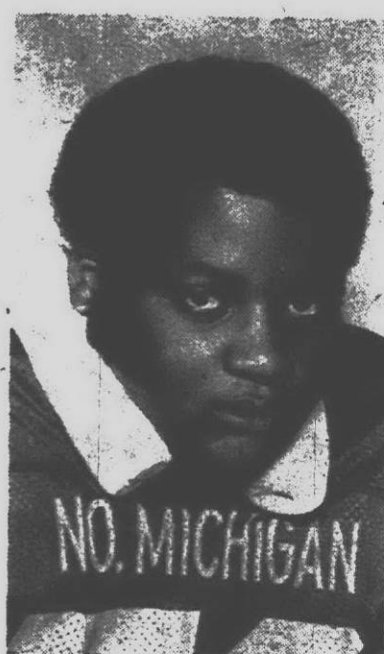

Bentley Hoping For Suburban Eight Upswing

Bentley High football Coach Glen Goode is the first to admit that Suburban Eight competition has been going "up, up and up."

"Our squad hasn't been that bad the past few seasons. The league is fast becoming one of the toughest in the state," said Goode who will be starting his fifth season as the Bulldog's head coach.

The highest the Bulldogs have finished under Goode was in his first season in 1969 when they placed third with a 5-3 mark.

It was then a drop to a 1-6-1 mark, 2-5-1 and last year to 2-7 where Bentley was outscored, 253 to 89.

Goode's list of nine return-

ing lettermen was sliced to eight when 6-4, 185-pound two-way performer Dave Waldo received a knee injury and will be watching the entire season from the sidelines.

The one point in Goode's favor is that the eight returning are all starters.

The main key to a winning season will be in the legs and

arms of 6-0, 185-pound senior quarterback Bob Wasilewski. "He runs and throws the ball as well as anyone around," stated Goode who utilized him as a halfback and quarterback in '72. Wasilewski is also a defensive halfback, and kicker.

"Bob is going to do just about everything for us except take tickets and pump

air in the balls," commented the Bulldog mentor. Back-up quarterback will be 5-7, 145-pound junior Bill Deacon.

The fullback slot is a three-way tangle between 5-10, 180-pound senior Kevin McGee, 5-11 180-pound Bob Cross and 6-0 180-pound senior Tom Dupree.

The No. 1 tailback contender is 5-11, 165-pound junior Bruce Boudnek who led the '71 junior varsity to a 5-1-2 championship with 11 touchdowns to his credit.

Senior Brian Murphy at 5-11 and 155 pounds is another tailback candidate.

At halfback will be senior Jerry Lacy (5-10 and 155 pounds) and junior Mike Penny (6-1 and 175 pounds).

In the receiver department, Goode commented, "We have been catching the ball better than ever before here at Bentley."

Bill Brown at 6-2 and 180 pounds, Phil Lawler at 5-10 and 185 pounds and Dale Altemang at 6-5 and 200 pounds fill out the end slots.

The offensive line is headed by junior center Jess Ghannam at 5-10 and 185 pounds. At the guard berths will be senior Chuck Romano (5-11 and 175 pounds) and junior Dave Kilpatrick (5-10 and 200 pounds).

Tackles are seniors Steve Akey at 6-0 and 195 pounds and Paul Roshirt at 6-0 and 215 pounds.

"We have had bigger teams before but not with as much speed as this year," added Goode.

The defensive lineup is paced by Romano at nose-guard, and Roshirt and 6-0, 195-pound Dave Robinson at the tackles. Defensive ends are Altemang and Penny, with Cross and McGee with a season's experience at line-backing.

The defensive secondary is filled out by Wasilewski, Lacy, Brown and 5-11, 145-pound Tom Schulz.

Wasilewski will handle the punting. He averaged 35 yards per punt last season with his longest a 70-yarder against Plymouth. The Bulldog quarterback also will be booting the extra points, field goals and kickoffs.

Goode is carrying 40 on the varsity but admits that he could have, at the maximum, nine players going both ways.

"We will be stressing defense with the breather going to come on the offense," he added. "Our offensive and defensive backs have to be a plus for us in their experience and talent."

The foursome of Dupree,

Lacy, Brown and Wasilewski is sporting two of Bentley's finer swimmers in Dupree and Lacy.

"It is unusual to have outstanding football talent in two excellent swimmers," said Goode. "The body build usually doesn't fit the two sports."

From the negative standpoint, Goode admitted that the offensive line will have to prove itself and this will be a

key to the success of the backfield.

The Bulldogs open on Sept. 14 at Lamphere and Suburban Eight action at Belleville on Sept. 21.

"Trenton is beyond a doubt the No. 1 club to beat this season in the Eight," finished Goode who is complemented by Pat O'Donnell, Steve Naumcheff, Tom Burke and Larry Jackson of the coaching staff.

Word from the American Bowling Congress reveals that work is progressing on an electric wonder that will produce league average sheets, including the standings of the various teams and the average of each bowler, a few moments after the league competition is finished.

It may require another season or two before the latest machine is perfected. But it is on the way.

Over 50? In Southfield Life Is Exciting!

Willow Lippert is a Southfield resident who is wholeheartedly dedicated to making those older years truly golden.

As director of Southfield's extensive "Over 50" program, Mrs. Lippert takes an innovative approach in reaching the 10,000 residents of her city who are over 60 as well as many who are below that mark.

Last winter senior citizens and teens shared a ski'n sea weekend at Harbor Springs, enjoying the unaccustomed benefits of each others' company. "Parents are often frightened of teenagers," explained Mrs. Lippert of the program's success, "but people in the senior years react to them very differently."

A SEPTEMBER 9 COMMUNITY CONCERT from 2 to 6 p.m., hosted

by Southfield's over 50 residents, will feature Tusco Heath, a folk singer with a decidedly country western flavor. Ice cream will be served by the senior adults to emphasize the feeling of an old fashioned get together. The concert will be held out of doors at the Civic Center.

A travel program provides senior adults with various opportunities to see the world. A 10-day trip to New England is scheduled for September 18; a 15-day trip to Hawaii is planned for October 6 and a four-day jaunt to Chicago will take off on November 23.

So enthusiastic has been the response to the travel program that Mrs. Lippert says many participants do their packing a full three weeks before their trip and talk about their plans frequently until they actually take off.

A monthly newsletter, put out by

the senior citizens, emphasizes topics of specific interest, such as social security, nursing homes and tax breaks for the elderly. Circulation has reached over a thousand.

In addition, there are a whirlwind of other regular activities for senior adults in Southfield, including cards, luncheons, hiking through the nature trails at the Civic Center, an arts and crafts program as well as casual drop in affairs.

Nor are all programs pre-planned and pre-canned for senior adults by Director Lippert. She encourages participation of members through such assignments as making reservations, taking deposits and coordinating various programs.

SOME SENIOR ADULTS, having begun as volunteer clerical workers, now receive payment from the City

"Often, people are afraid of going into a period of life that they feel holds a nothingness," she explains. She would like the senior years to be viewed as a beginning rather than an end.

Retirement can create very traumatic problems for a couple. Round the clock togetherness, it seems, requires some major adjustments to be palatable and pleasant, Mrs. Lippert explains.

Living within a limited income is another difficulty which the majority of elderly people must cope with. There are in Southfield a certain number of elderly people who live very well, but the great majority, in Mrs. Lippert's experience, are forced to live with careful frugality.

"The rest of the community often looks down on older people," continued Mrs. Lippert who finds that

RETIREMENT HOUSING: A MATTER OF CHOICE

Retirement housing is many things to many people. Because retirement involves a major change in life style, it usually necessitates a change in environment and in living quarters.

Experts point to a number of alternatives, all with strengths and weaknesses, that retirees can consider before finding a suitable place to settle down.

THE FAMILY HOME, because of emotional and financial factors, is for many older people a good choice. It is probably paid for and the memories that it contains can be a source of comfort for many people.

But because it was probably purchased at a time when children were all at home, it is often too big for just a retired couple. Such tasks as cleaning second floor windows and repairing upstairs gutters make maintenance a problem for many.

Renting an apartment can mean a carefree life for many elderly people. There's no maintenance involved, and there's a good deal of flexibility. Apartment dwellers can take off on worry free vacations as often as they wish; they can sublease their quarters or they can easily move on to another place when their lease expires.

IT'S IMPORTANT TO CHOOSE an apartment that is close to shopping and community facilities. One within walking distance of public transportation is a highly desirable point for many older people.

A happy choice for many people, apartment dwelling is not recommended for those whose pleasures lie in gardening and puttering about their workshops.

Trailer living, formerly considered to be a refuge for transients and people hanging on to a marginal mode of existence, has become very respectable, especially among retirees.

Still much less expensive than

houses, trailers have become ingenious in design with nearly everything including range, refrigerator, beds and sofas, being built in. Housework in a trailer is very minimal.

Location, here, is especially important. Many trailer parks, while lovely in scenery and landscaping, are too far from the amenities of civilization -- doctors' offices, stores, recreational facilities -- to be a good choice for many older people.

RETIREMENT HOMES are usually regarded as a haven for elderly people with health problems or those no longer able to cope with the mechanics of daily life. There are senior adults, however, still in fine health, who prefer these homes above all other modes of living. Here daily needs, including meals and health care, are met regularly and, of course, there is built-in companionship with the other residents.

Newly retired persons are advised to keep their eyes on the better retirement homes in their community. When and if they decide to move into one, they'll have an idea as to what is available.

Living with children, while sometimes necessary for financial reasons, is usually not advised. Such a living arrangement, it seems, seldom works out well, although people who are doing it will try to paint a rosy picture of its joys.

Striving to please and to adjust to a different generation, retired parents often come to feel hampered in their daily living habits; soon enough they retreat to a bedroom or to the outdoors just to maintain their privacy and sense of independence.

There are many things to consider in deciding on a retirement residence. Children, friends and neighbors -- helpful and well meaning as they are -- will seek to give advice, but in the long run, the choice must be made by the retirees themselves.



of Southfield for their efforts during busy periods.

"Some of the youngest people I know are 85," comments Willow Lippert about the people she works with.

"Retirement can be very bewildering," she adds. "I find it a real challenge in providing more options to senior citizens in their daily lives."

What are the biggest problems of aging? Mrs. Lippert points to several.

senior citizen programs themselves are often belittled, as well.

Nevertheless, she is going ahead at full steam. The entire lower level of the Southfield Parks and Recreation Building is being handsomely remodeled for use by senior adults, thus enabling an already lively program to expand considerably.

Southfield's senior citizens are well served, if they choose to be, by their city's recreation program, facilities and its enthusiastic leadership.

As always life is what you make it. It is entirely possible for the elderly person to survey his future with the attitude of poet Robert Browning who said, "The best is yet to be!"

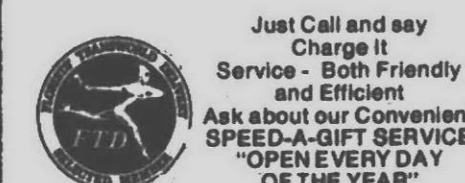
