

## Is City Stalling Recreation Pact?

The Plymouth City Commission has, by inaction, delayed the start of the area-wide recreation authority at least three weeks.

Thus far, the city has failed to approve an agreement which would officially create the Plymouth-Canton Recreation Authority.

Three other governmental units participating in the authority's formation — Plymouth School District and Plymouth and Canton townships — signed a pact to formally create the authority in April.

In addition, each approved monetary pledges to the authority by last week and anticipated the city's support Monday night.

The issue was not placed on the city commission's agenda for Monday even though city officials were aware that the other participating governmental units have agreed on a per capita pledge and reached agreement on the authority's formation.

The matter was discussed before the commission when two of the city's representatives to the authority board, Karen Miller and Howard Schryer, spoke up during the session of the meeting opened to "citizens' comments."

Following that, the commission scheduled the matter for discussion at a workshop session for 7:30 p.m. Oct. 8 at city hall.

Mrs. Miller told the commission that the city's representatives to the authority board were "looking to the commission for further direction."

Schryer said, "We're going to need some help on the legal end of this."

"A good package, a master agreement is going to have to be signed before we do anything," he stressed, adding that commissioners should discuss legal implications of the agreement with other participating governmental units.

"We're all tied up. We have nowhere to go," he said. "It's time for the city and the townships and schools to get together on this."

Schryer said the recreation authority board had planned to meet next week to finalize plans for starting its recreation program, but that meeting must be postponed until the city takes some action.

The authority board has been studying how to equate funding from the governmental units on an equitable basis and issued a computation based on \$1.23 per capita annually for each of three municipalities.

The school district's financial participation was placed at \$21,000 annually initially. This would be decreased in succeeding years to remove the schools participation financially but the authority would continue to rely on the schools for use of facilities.

Pledges from the two townships and the schools made recently are based on a nine-month period starting this month to carry the authority's budget through May when a full budget year would begin.

Thus the pledges made so far by Plymouth and Canton townships and the

school district amount to three-fourths of their initial amounts.

Plymouth Township pledged \$15,827; Canton Township pledged \$17,894 and the schools pledged \$14,000 plus office space, accounting, auditing, employee benefits and facilities use.

The city's share, based on those pledges, would be \$10,741 for the first nine months of the authority.

On April 9, the city commission agreed informally to make a \$10,000 pledge to the authority once an agreement is reached by all four participating units.

A dissolution clause in the agreement, signed by the other units, was singled out by the city commission as being too loose and the commissioners have said they will not approve the agreement until that is removed.

Howard Oldford, president of the recreation authority board, said that with the pledges and agreements from the other units, the authority is "so close" to becoming a reality.

"We've got everything, but yet we haven't got it," Oldford said.

He said the authority's first nine-month schedule would include activities like: junior football, hockey, basketball, archery, badminton, bridge, and arts and crafts.

But before that program can be started, the city must ratify the authority agreement and approve funding along with the other governmental units.

## Mettetal Up For Sale; Livonia Eyes Facility

Livonia's research into the possible need and availability of a near-by municipal airport received an unexpected boost this week when it became known that Mettetal Airport definitely is up for sale.

Robert Mettetal, senior partner with his brother Marvin in ownership of the 74-acre facility on Joy Road less than a mile west of Haggerty, told Observer Newspapers on Monday, "Yes, we would sell."

Mettetal Airport opened under the family's ownership in 1939 and is in Canton Township, on the south side of Joy. It is zoned M-2 (heavy industry), and Mettetal said he has had "too many requests from real estate agents to court" asking permission in recent years to list the property for sale. To date he has refused them all.

"I would like to see this land kept as an airport rather than be converted to industry, or even to housing," said Mettetal, who was an expert flyer himself until grounded by a heart attack in the late '60s.

"However, property taxes have gone up so high in the last three years that now we're paying 40 to 45 percent of our gross income just for taxes. What this amounts to is that we're running an airport for the general service of the surrounding area for free. It simply isn't worth it."

Mettetal declined to set a calendar deadline on the family's decision as to the airport's eventual fate, but did reemphasize his desire that the acreage be retained for this use if at all possible. Livonia's official interest

as a possible purchaser stemmed from a report submitted to the city council by Mayor Edward McNamara suggesting official consideration of a study concerning the city's airport facilities.

The minutes of council's Aug. 29 meeting show that McNamara's proposal "to study existing nearby airports for possible acquisition and use as a municipal airport" was tabled pending a report from Industrial Coordinator Daniel Gilmartin.

Gilmartin, in turn, has mailed questionnaires to 175 of Livonia's foremost business and industrial concerns, inquiring into their flight needs and habits and whether they have company-owned

aircraft. A summary of the answers will be turned over to council later in the month, when action on the original survey proposal will be forced to a head.

The city's portion of the cost of such a study would be \$5,000. Another \$5,000 would be paid by the state and the FAA would pay \$20,000.

At no time in their discussions have city officials referred specifically to Mettetal Airport as the facility in mind, yet they smilingly say it obviously isn't Metro or Willow Run — and that about runs out the string.

A study into airport facilities by Canton and Plymouth several years ago pointed out that federal and

state assistance would be available, if ownership were transferred from private to municipal status.

At that time, 189 aircraft were permanently based at the airport, and it was reported that "50 to 60 requests have been received from industry executives to locate planes at the field."

"The importance of Mettetal Airport to the industrial hopes of the area cannot be overemphasized," said the report, which was prepared at that time with the thinking that a Plymouth-Canton Airport Authority type of ownership might result.

Selling price of the facility, said Mettetal, will be a minimum of \$1 million.

## Observer PR Seminar Reset For Sept. 26

Those registered for the Sept. 12 program, which was postponed, are urged to attend on the new Sept. 26 date. There isn't room for additional registrants since the class already numbers 80. That's as many as the Observer can handle with its limited seating capacity.

## Lee Faces Polygraph

Terry W. Lee, 18, of Plymouth, who is being held in lieu of \$50,000 bond charged with "assault with intent to commit murder," faces a polygraph test this week.

The decision was handed down by Ypsilanti District Judge Robert Fink when Lee appeared for pretrial examination on the charge.

He is being held by the Washtenaw County Sheriff following his arrest Sept. 11 for allegedly knifing Robert E. Wallace of South Lyon

during a scuffle outside a bar on Sept. 7.

Lee, Phyllis Williams, 26, of Livonia, and Henry E. Peer, 25, of Plymouth, are also charged in the Aug. 16 death of Karl Godina, 19, of Livonia.

The trio are free on bond in the second degree murder charge.

A scheduled hearing before District Judge Dunbar Davis of a plea to dismiss the murder charge, has been postponed to Monday at the request of defense attorneys.

## Twp. Fees Kill Co-op Nursery

The Little Pilgrims of Plymouth Parents Co-operative Nursery, in Plymouth Township, has been frustrated in its attempts to find a home for itself in the community.

Mrs. Sharon Flowers, nursery president, said the organization is still seeking a building in which to base their operations.

She said plans to rent space from the First Methodist Church fell through because the nursery could not afford to pay a \$400 fee for Plymouth Township Planning Commission meetings.

"We believe the township was unfair in asking a non-profit organization such as ours to pay that large of a fee. We asked that the fee be reduced to a nominal figure — such as \$50 or so, but our request was rejected," Mrs. Flowers said.

"No other local government in the area charges this type of fee for a non-profit group, and some charge nothing. It's difficult for groups which depend on people power rather than money to come up with \$400," she said.

Mrs. Helen Richardson, Plymouth Township clerk, said the standard fee charged by the planning commission is \$750, as outlined by township ordinance. "The township offered to reduce this fee to \$400, because the nursery would be operated in an already existing building and there would be no need for inspection by

the township planner or engineer. But a \$400 charge is still necessary to cover other expenses," the clerk said.

"Mrs. Flowers said it isn't fair for us to charge a non-profit group such a large amount, but I believe it would be unfair for us to waive the charge for her, but not for the man who is making a living. I think they were given a generous offer anyway. This was the first time the township had ever reduced the fee," Mrs. Richardson said.

Mrs. Flowers said the Methodist Church building has now been rented out to another group and is unavailable to the nursery, but she is still contesting "the principal of the thing."

The nursery has 23 paid members and another 20 persons who are interested, the president said.

"We're checking into a couple of other possibilities right now, but we are still without a home," Mrs. Flowers said.

"If the organization should fold, all those persons with paid memberships will be given refunds."

Other officers of the nursery are Shari Brooks, vice president; Karen Eaton, secretary; Ellen Webb, membership chairman, and Christina Stewart, treasurer.

"We're hoping to find someone who will deliver our members and their children from this plight and give us a home," Mrs. Flowers concluded.

flower Village," the developer was asked to find another name in light of the drive for Canton identity and the fact that many newer Canton developments have used Plymouth-sounding names.

Practical Homes Inc. agreed and picked "Sunflower Village" as the name of what will be Canton's largest development.

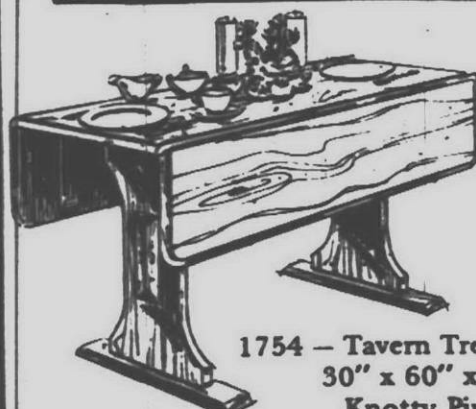

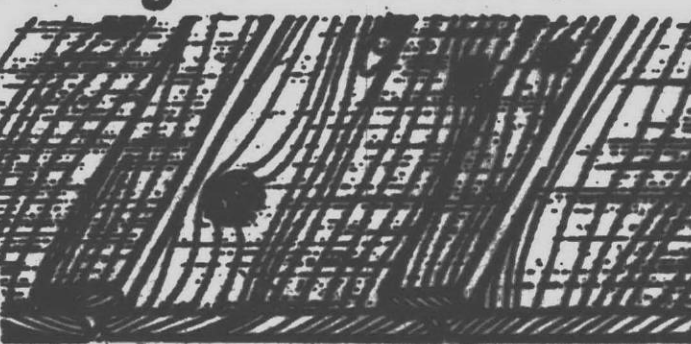

## Teacher Strikes Hurt Public Most

Teacher strikes in local school districts this year are far more widespread than ever before.

Garden City teachers held their first strike in history, for four days, before a settlement was reached. Livonia's was a first, too.

Teachers in Southfield, Redford Union, South Redford and Clarenceville districts worked without contracts while bargaining continued. Plymouth teachers reached their settlement last year.

AS IN THE case in most collective bargaining breakdowns, a teacher strike hurts everybody involved.

It hits teachers, who don't get their paychecks for a while. It louses up school administration planning, forcing all kinds of rescheduling of early school-year activity.

It affects other employees of school systems, who may be laid off because a teachers strike means the system is not running and has reduced need for help.

High school football squads, who are required to hold 14 days of practice before their first game, find themselves in a pickle if coaches won't hold practice drills during a strike.

Local mothers, who had hoped the opening of school would give them a bit of much-needed peace and quiet, find no relief.

Local school administrators and boards, faced with steep contract demands, find quickly there isn't enough money to go around and are forced either to cut expenses (and, probably, school quality) or boost taxes.

Local taxpayers, still caught in the property tax squeeze, equate, probably accurately, a teacher strike with yet another millage.

AND SO THE circus goes on, and on.

Nobody likes it. Livonia Education Association President Keith Geiger says "a strike doesn't help anybody." His opposite number, Livonia School Superintendent Rolland Upton, agrees: "These young people pass this way but once . . . a strike hurts everybody, but it hurts the kids the most."

Trouble is that although everybody involved keeps saying teacher strikes don't help anyone, nobody feels enough pressure on them either to settle before a strike or to eliminate it.

School boards know that in the long run everybody will go back to work and that someone (meaning local taxpayers or the state as a whole) will pick up the tab. Teachers know that, too, and besides they don't want to give up the strike as a weapon.

The fact remains, however, that teachers are public employees; any teacher strike in the last analysis affects directly the willingness of the public to pay tax money to settle it.

A better solution has got to be found, and quickly, before everybody gets fed up with the situation and the public decides that it might as well get into the act and starts directing its anger at our whole system of local education.

## Parents Really Worked Up

Did the teachers go too far this year in the strikes that closed schools in Livonia, Farmington, Garden City and Birmingham and in nearly keeping students at home in Redford Township and Southfield?

Judging from the great number of nasty letters we have received in the past week or so, we would have to say teachers' images were damaged considerably in all these communities.

Parents don't want their children around the house after a long summer vacation, and the youngsters would much rather be in school than loafing.

We might add that many parents have expressed fear of retaliation if they express their views on the strikes.

Fortunately, the sticky situations in Farmington and Livonia appear to be resolved. At least, agreements have been reached to open the schools for classes while negotiations continue. Garden City settled earlier.

Which automatically brings up a point: If the teachers return to classes after walking the picket lines for two weeks, why couldn't the same kind of an agreement have been reached before Labor Day?

Under the present circumstances, the strike has aroused parents to the point where they were thinking of starting court actions to get

the teachers back at the blackboard.

However, the feelings of parents most certainly are reflected in unsigned letters sent to the Observer, letters which should make members of the various teachers' unions sit up and listen.

This is a sample: "For the well-being of my child in school, I prefer not to sign my name, but I do wish my thoughts could be brought forth to the public."

"The teacher strike in Farmington is really a sham. The teachers claim they are fighting for class size . . . with enrollment dropping each year, the classes have not been as large."

"Their placards read 'we care' . . . if they really did care and were dedicated to their profession, they would be in school instead of acting like common laborers. It's too bad the schools could not see fit to fire the lot and start over."

Then there is the "bitter" mother from Livonia who writes, "I'm sure this letter will never be printed because I cannot sign my name. I'm sure if I did, the dedicated ladies behind the desks at — elementary school and — junior high would make life miserable for my children."

Is that the feeling the teachers want in Livonia? Is that what they hope to generate? A belief that teachers are vindictive and can't be criticized?

We most certainly hope

not, but one can't get away from the fact that this is the way some folks believe.

True enough, there are always some who go way out on a limb to express their thoughts, and sometimes those thoughts are extreme. The fact remains that suddenly there are quite a few with this kind of thinking, and that isn't good for teachers trying to make good impressions.

That same party who is afraid to sign the name goes on: "I am fed up with the greed of these so-called dedicated Livonia teachers. Let them stay on strike . . . our children will go to school 182 days regardless. So the teachers may be teaching through Christmas vacation, Easter vacation or during their three-month summer vacation."

"Why didn't they negotiate their contracts last June after school was out instead of the day before classes start in September?"

"I'm sick of the teachers using our children as pawns to get what they want no matter how much the children suffer. They'll get what they want, because they know they have everyone over a barrel."

There are other letters in our files from bitter parents in Westland and Farmington expressing their disgust for the actions of the teachers and their unions.

All express desires to have their youngsters in schools,

not in late September but at the scheduled start a day after Labor Day.

Many can't understand how the teachers can strike when state law says they can't. They call this a flagrant violation of the law and wonder why the teachers, like other public servants, aren't ordered into court and told to get back in classes.

There are a good many individuals in all parts of the state who have the same feeling, and it may be that teeth will be put into the laws to make things a bit rough for the teachers come another contract time.

One wonders just what the teachers think of this kind of adverse publicity.

We know how one felt a few days ago. He screamed like a wild man when calling the office to complain about a story that appeared in the newspapers. He was so wild that one questions whether he should be allowed to retain his job.

After all, if he is that irate after reading an article, how does he conduct himself when irritated by students?

Fortunately, at the time this was written, Farmington and Livonia teachers had agreed to go back to classes. That will relieve some of the mutterings, but we're sure the teachers haven't heard the last of it. Time alone will tell.

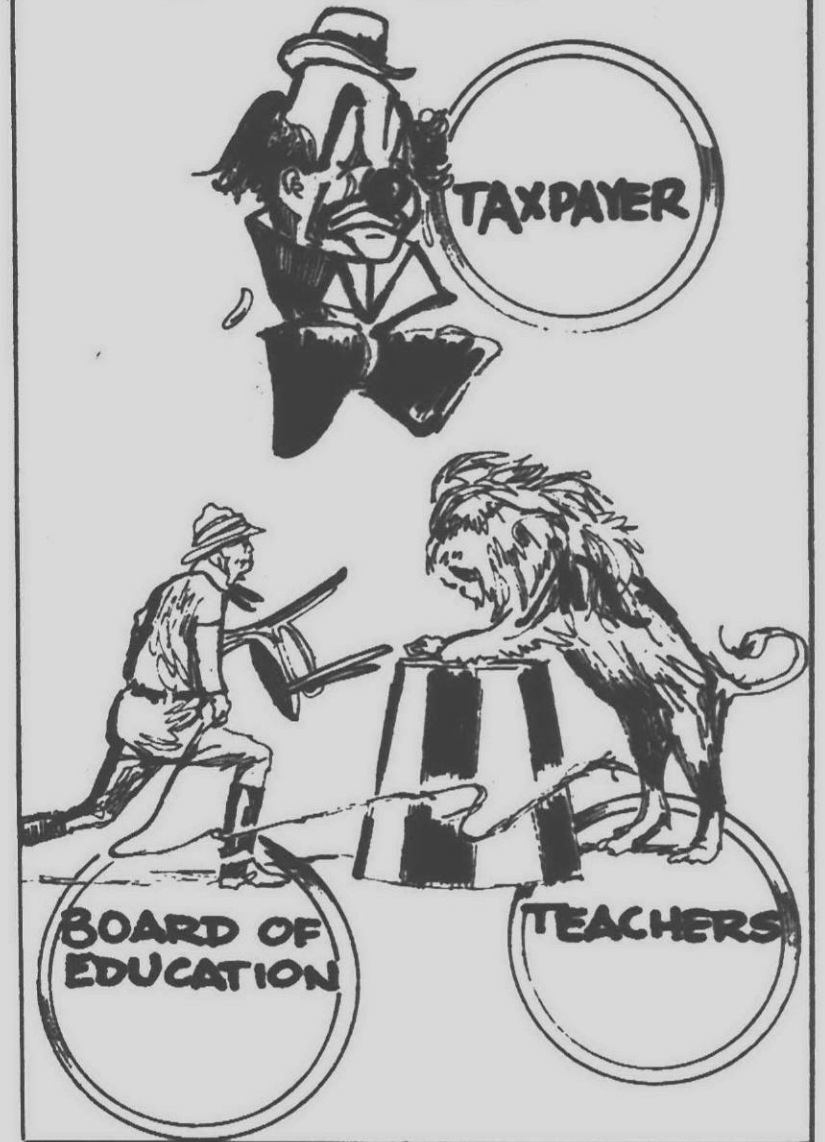

teachers would average a mere 10 minutes of classroom instruction.

I object to paying high taxes when teachers baby-sit instead of teaching. I also object to unearned higher salaries, increments, and tenure. Other professionals must earn similar salaries over a 12-month, 40-hour per week period, and must produce to get merit raises and retain their jobs.

My hat is off to the few dedicated TEACHERS in the Farmington district. They deserve every support from the community. But for the majority of teachers I would suggest independent evaluating committees, similar to those used by many universities, who would make unbiased teacher evaluations every two years. They would be empowered to weed out the "do-nothings," and education would improve.

## Time Voters Know What's Happening

Plymouth Township has instructed its attorney to file suit against township firemen who are picketing because, the board maintains, the firemen have a contract.

Trustees representatives of the firefighters' union and the township board — in "executive" session — reached accord, and thus the firemen have a contract.

What the board failed to mention was that at no time has it ever approved a new contract in open official action at a regular or special township meeting.

Until such time, it has no claim "that a valid contract exists."

It may be true firemen voted to ratify a pact, but their union officials have not all signed the agreement, and though the township board has voted informally to approve, the trustees have not officially voted on it.

This is not the first time the Plymouth Township board has decided something "unofficially" that it then considers official.

For example, the board met in "executive" (secret) session to instruct its attorney to contest the annexation petition which recently came before the State Boundary Commission.

Although what was really

determined was a matter of policy, the board failed to give township residents the benefit of discussing it at a public meeting.

Another example of how the board has, in recent history, kept a decision from the public was its refusal to make public a copy of the proposed 1973-74 township budget before it was approved by the board.

It is time the Plymouth Township board realizes township residents have a right to participate in the decision-making process of their government.

The residents can't do that if the board makes policies behind closed doors, "ra-

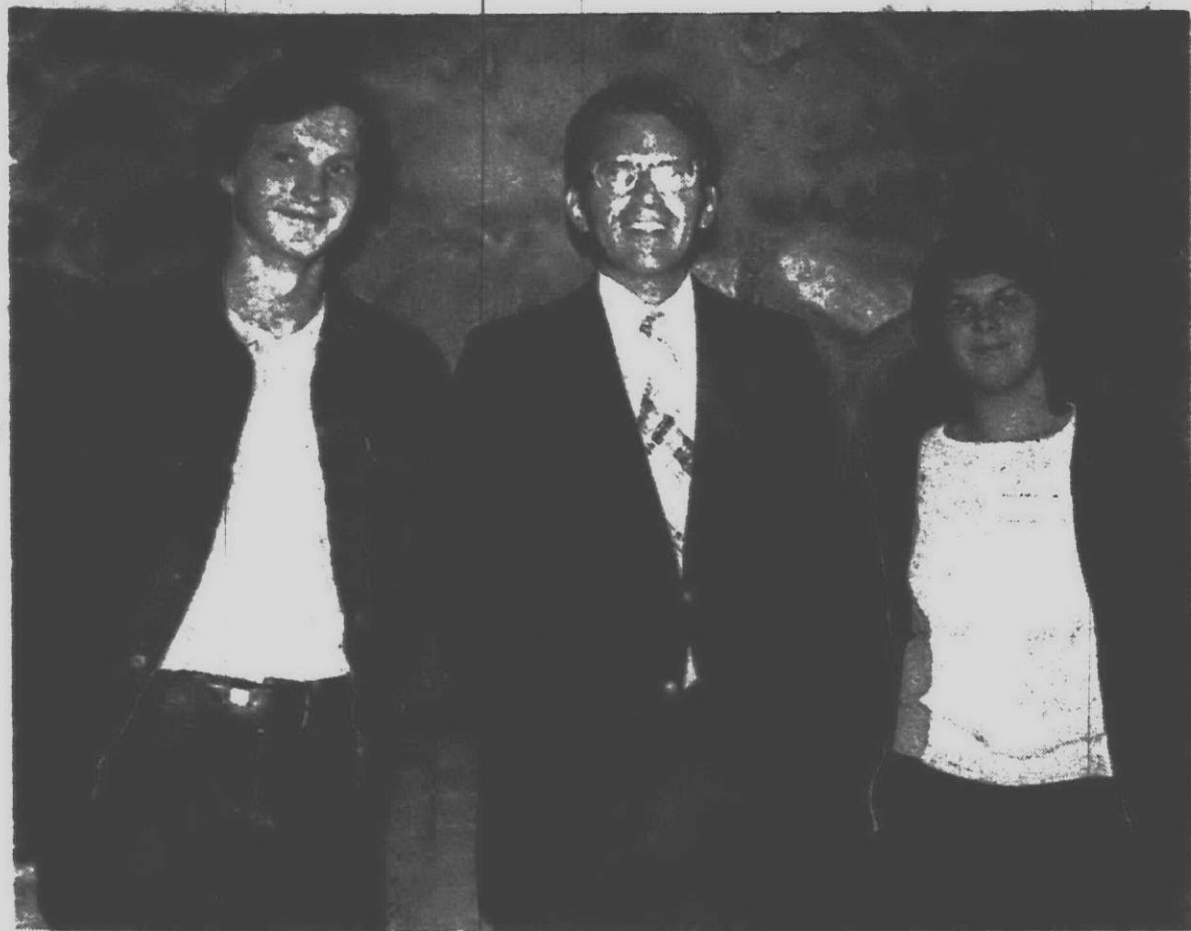
tifies" contracts in "executive" session, or keeps necessary information from the public.

How can the township board maintain firemen have a "valid" contract when it not only hasn't been signed by the proper firemen's union officials, but hasn't been legally adopted by the township board either?

Certainly that question will be asked during the current dispute with the firemen.

Perhaps it will be answered by lawyers from both sides, but whatever the legal implications of the board's attitude, township residents have again been left out.

## Canton OKs 'New Towne'

CANTON A commercial center of more than 15 acres located on the northwest corner of Ford and Sheldon roads will be developed under the name "New Towne Center."

Canton Township Board approved the site plan for the development during its last meeting.

Plans call for 95,000 square feet for a major department store described by the developer as "The third largest retailer in the nation, next to Sears and Penney's."

A representative of Ramco Associates, the developer for the project, said he would not be free to release the

name of the tenant until a formal agreement was reached with the tenant. That agreement was expected at the end of this week.

The center will also include a major supermarket, a drug store and 16,000 square feet for other retail stores.

In reaction to other recommendations from the township planning commission, the board approved a site plan for apartments, tabled plans for a trailer sales location and approved a preliminary plat for a subdivision.

A site plan was approved for Canton Colony Apart-

ments, a development to be located on the west side of Lotz, north of Michigan Avenue. The complex will include one and two-bedroom apartments, a community facility and a swimming pool.

Approval of a preliminary plat for Brookside Village Subdivision No. 1 was given by the board. The subdivision will be located south of Cherry Hill and east of Lotz.

A site plan for Walker Realty Co. Trailer Sales was tabled when a representative for the company failed to appear at the board meeting. Township Clerk John Flodin said he didn't know whether the company had been notified that its request would be on the agenda.

## 2 Historic Landmarks Cited

**PLYMOUTH**  
Plymouth Landmarks 1973, a program initiated this year to highlight Heritage Day, will be a featured part of future Michigan Week observances in Plymouth.

Receiving plaques this year were the old Birch House, 48700 North Territorial Rd., Plymouth Township, and old Wilcox House,

**Helbrook Street in Plymouth.**  
The Birch House took its name from an owner, Robert Birch, who purchased the home in 1888, and raised vegetables and nine children.

The house was moved from North Main Street to North Territorial Road in 1971, by Marion Sober who plans to restore the house built in Greek Revival style. Noted

for its basic simplicity the house has four columns across the center section and two wings. The roof is relatively flat with no dormers; however, the end is outlined

with detail. There are no arches or rounded windows.

Another Greek Revival style house, the Wilcox house also took its name from two brothers who purchased the house, 320 acres of land, and a wood and grist mill.

Henry Ford later purchased all but two acres of the land using it for a factory and a park. In 1940 the Harold Guenther purchased the house from John Wilcox, and have since restored it.

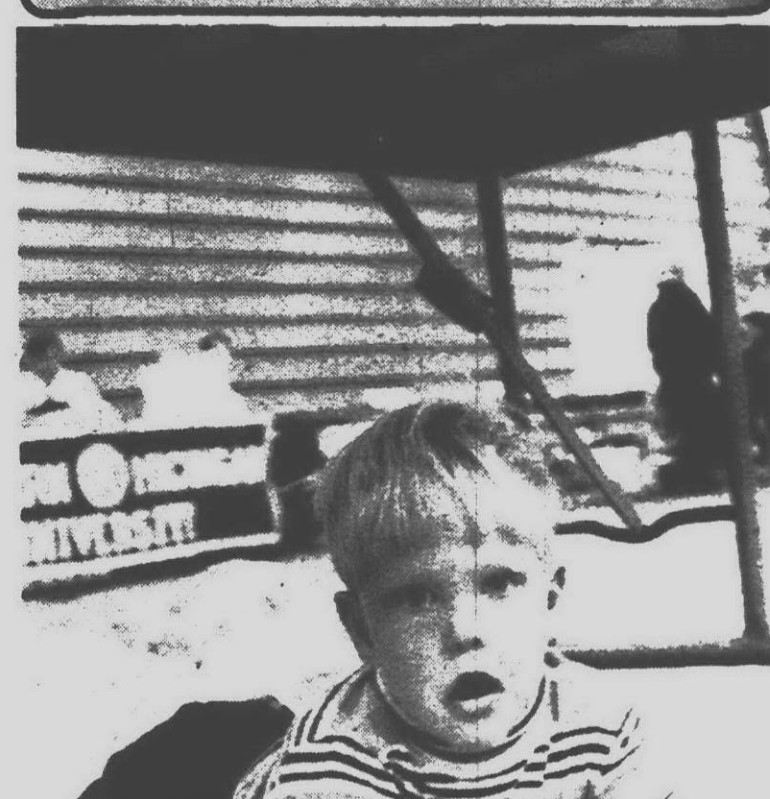

## Opportunity Knocks At Fair

When opportunity knocks, be ready to accept, be positive, be versatile, know your rights, be sophisticated.

The advice comes from the Women's Opportunity Fair that filled the Schoolcraft College gymnasium and adjoining classrooms Friday.

Some 200 women - students and visitors from the community - had a chance to gather information on educational employment, community service and organizational opportunities.

Ranging along long tables set up in the gym, they could pick up pamphlets about a variety of opportunities of interest.

Represented were colleges and universities, particularly their extension divisions and

the Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service.

Volunteer organizations, including the Children's Hospital, the Arthritis Foundation, 35th District Court probation department, the Michigan Cancer Foundation and the Girl Scouts and Camp Fire Girls also were on hand to tell women about the opportunities they offer.

In addition, several organizations, including Livonia and Plymouth branches of the American Association of University Women, the Redford Toastmistress Club and the Schoolcraft chapter of the National Organization of Women had tables set up and literature to distribute.

The women who left the gym for an adjacent classroom heard several speakers dispensing specific information on using the college's employment service, knowing their rights as employed women, increasing their self-understanding and the all-important business of getting a job.

Mrs. Peg Sanborn, Schoolcraft's business co-op coordinator, gave the opportunity seekers a business-like run-down on the steps to job-hunting.

Other speakers were Ronald Monfette, Schoolcraft director of placement, Jean Pike, counselor and instructor in the college's human potential seminar course and Dorothy Smith, representing the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity office.

"Be sophisticated about going after a job," Mrs. Sanborn advised the women.

"First, put together a resume. It should include pertinent facts about you, name, telephone number, age, marital status, number of children, social security number.

"Then give your qualifications for the job for which you are applying, listing your education and previous employment and starting with the most recent.

"Point out the thing about you that qualifies you for the job, and be positive about it. If the job is retailing, mention previous work or courses that have helped you work well with people."

Former jobs, she added, should be mentioned going back at least five years, and only the major ones need be listed.

References should be listed with telephone numbers "to make it easy for the employer to get in contact with them," she said.

The reason for making a resume, Mrs. Sanborn said, is that it organizes information.

"You may send it to a prospective employer or you may use it in filling out a job application," she added. "But in any case it can save time during a job interview and give background for talking about the job."

During a job interview, Mrs. Sanborn said, women returning to the business world should "wear business-like attire - no pants suits, even though you might find later you could wear them on the job."

"Be prepared to tell the prospective employer why you are interested in working for that particular firm," she recommended, "and before you leave ask when he expects to make a decision."

She also suggested an extra job-hunting touch - writing a note to the prospective employer following the interview, thanking him for his time and mentioning some specific matter that was discussed.

Monfette, who heads Schoolcraft's new placement office, said the office was set up to help students have the

financial resources so that they can complete their studies and give them a better life.

"Many students in all age groups have used the service," he added, "but at this point I have 180 jobs that I can't get kids to fill."

He said he also works with graduating students "because we feel every student worthy of graduation is also worthy of a good job when the training is completed."

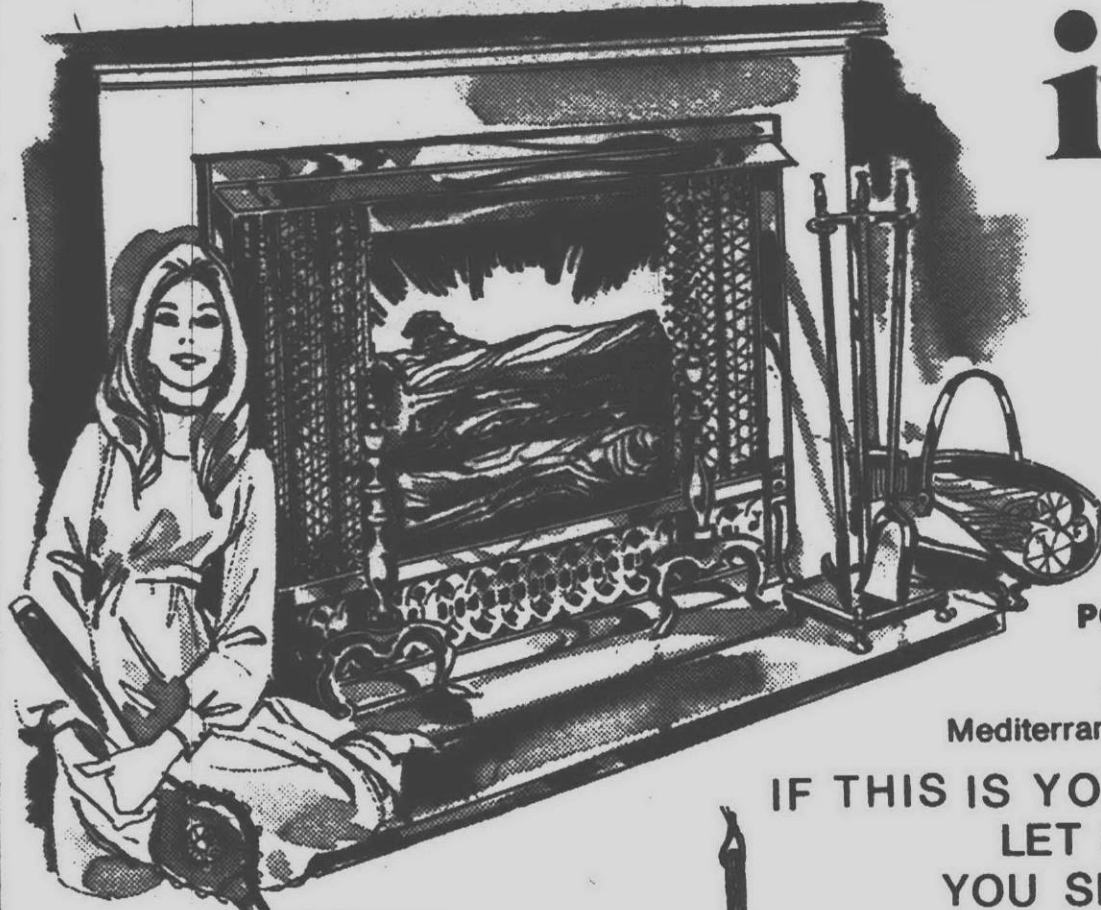

"An opponent of the legislation put it in as an amendment - a rise to lead Congress to throw the whole thing out. But that move backfired."

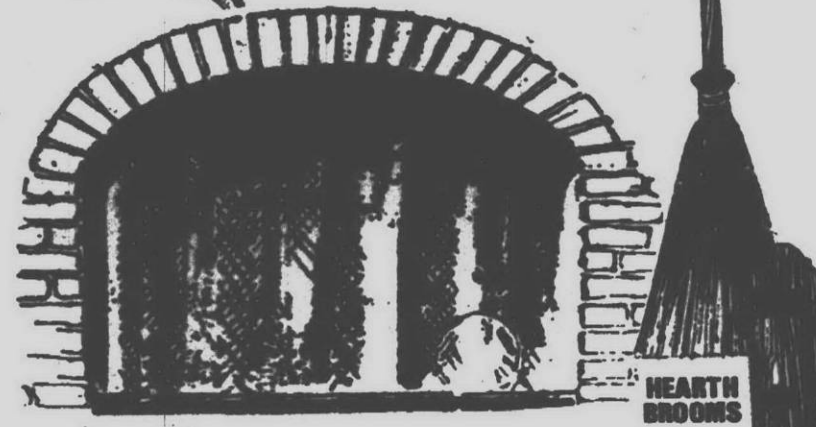

## 'New Horizons' Finds Home At Westbrook

New Horizons, a rehabilitation program for mentally and physically handicapped young adults, is expected to move into the west wing of Westbrook Elementary School in Clarenceville sometime this month.

The program is currently housed in a deteriorating building at 35100 Grand River in Farmington which is owned by Bob Saks Oldsmobile.

After occupying the building for nearly six years, New Horizons has been asked by the owner to vacate it so he can either renovate or demolish it. Westbrook is located at 21120 Osmus in Farmington Hills.

A total of 25 clients participate in the vocational rehabilitation program under the direction of four staff members. They participate in work activities where they develop coordination and become familiar with a job environment.

Once the clients reach a certain level of achievement, most of them transfer to the New Horizons sheltered workshop in Pontiac where they get advanced experience. The sheltered workshop is generally the final step before they get jobs within the community.

The move to Westbrook is considered beneficial for both the school district and the young adults. It gives the district an opportunity to rent classrooms which have been vacated due to dwindling elementary enrollments.

It also gives the young adults a brighter environment with better facilities for the program. The move to Westbrook hinges on approval of a contract with New Horizons which is anticipated later this week.

## TO THE GAS CUSTOMERS OF CONSUMERS POWER COMPANY

### NOTICE OF HEARING ON A CONSERVATION PROGRAM INVOLVING NATURAL GAS RATES

On September 7, 1973, Consumers Power Company applied to the Michigan Public Service Commission for approval of a program for the conservation of natural gas by encouraging and assisting residential customers in the insulation of their homes heated by natural gas. (Case No. U-4416.)

The Company's application states that large numbers of the Company's residential space heating customers reside in older houses which do not have insulation meeting current standards established by the Federal Housing Administration. Studies by the Company indicate that installation of ceiling insulation meeting current FHA standards in a typical house built in the Company's service area prior to 1942 would reduce the quantity of gas used for heating by about 21 percent; and that installing sufficient ceiling insulation to meet current FHA standards in a typical house built in the Company's service area after 1942 would reduce the quantity of gas used for heating by about 10 percent.

The application states that, despite extraordinary efforts, the Company has been forced by the current national shortage of natural gas and resultant curtailments in deliveries from the Company's interstate gas suppliers, to institute restrictions upon gas sales in the Company's service area which currently affect all but residential customers. The application states that the proposed home insulation service program is in the public interest because it seeks to partially relieve the shortage in natural gas supply.

The program which the Company proposes would include the use of mass media and other means to communicate to the public the need for conservation of natural gas and the contribution which home insulation can make to that goal.

The Company would urge homeowners to install insulation themselves or to hire a contractor to do so. The Company would also offer, on a non-profit basis to the Company, to arrange for the installation, in residential premises owned by any qualified residential space heating customer, of ceiling insulation meeting the most recent FHA standard. A residential space heating customer would qualify for the program if he has a satisfactory utility bill payment history. Where the Company thus arranged for installation, it would finance up to the smaller of 80 percent or \$300 of the cost, over a period of up to 36 months, at an interest rate of 1 percent per month on unpaid balance. The Company would not itself sell insulation or install insulation, but would subcontract the work

to dealers and contractors. Under the proposed amendments, any sums owed the Company for installation or insulation would be a part of the charge for residential space heating gas service rendered to the insulated premises; and the cost of such installation, if not paid for by the residential space heating customer who contracted for the work, would be charged to successor customers at the insulated premises at the rate of \$5 per month.

The application asks the Michigan Public Service Commission to authorize the Company's participation in the home insulation service program; and to authorize the Company to include all costs associated with the program as a part of utility cost of service, to be reflected in rates hereafter prescribed by the Commission for the Company.

A public hearing will be held at 9:30 AM, on October 5, 1973 in the offices of the Commission, Law Building, Lansing, Michigan 48913, for the purpose of determining whether the approvals sought should be granted. Any interested parties may attend the hearing and participate subject to the provisions of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. Copies of the application may be obtained from the Secretary of the Commission, Law Building, Lansing, Michigan 48913, or from the Secretary of Consumers Power Company, 212 W. Michigan Avenue, Jackson, Michigan 49201.

The Commission's jurisdiction of this matter is pursuant to Section 4 of 1919 P.A. 419, as amended, M.C.L.A. 460.54; Sections 4, 6 and 6a of 1939 P.A. 3, as amended, M.C.L.A. 460.4, 460.6, 460.6a; Section 63 of 1969 P.A. 306, M.C.L.A. 24.263, and the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 1954 Administrative Code, as amended, No. 54, R 460.11, et seq.

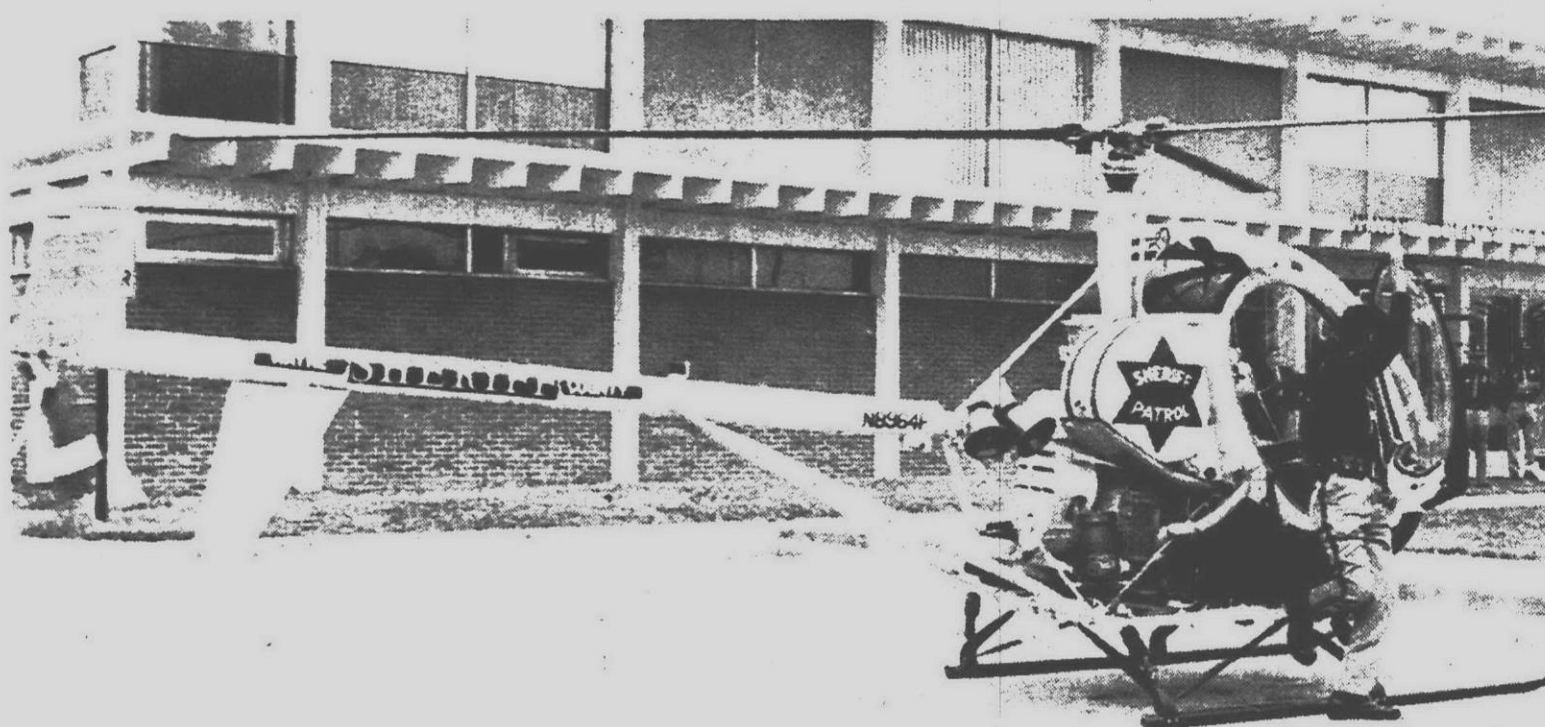

## Tahquamenon: Most Popular Spot In The UP

A spectacular waterfall, largest in the Midwest, more than 19,000 acres of forest, streams and lakes - all are at Tahquamenon Falls State Park. No other state park offers the camper as much natural beauty, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

The park, most popular in the upper peninsula, is 20 miles northeast of Newberry on M-123. Last year it attracted 500,490 campers, top attendance at the UP's 16 state parks.

The park has three campgrounds. The Lower Tahquamenon Falls has 183 sites with modern facilities, electricity and a park concession. Two other campgrounds are near the mouth of the Tahquamenon River, five miles south of Paradise. One has 76 sites and modern facilities, the other 60 sites and primitive facilities.

The Lower Tahquamenon Falls campground has no swimming, but there is good swimming at the two Rivermouth campgrounds and also a boat ramp.

Adjacent to the Lower Falls are picnic grounds, ample parking, a store and boat livery. There also is a trailer sanitation disposal station.

There is fishing for trout, pike, walleyes, muskie and perch in the Tahquamenon River.

A four-mile hiking trail runs along the river between the falls.

The Upper and Lower Tahquamenon Falls are one of Michigan's top tourist attractions. Next to Niagara, the Upper Falls is the largest east of the Mississippi River, with a sheer drop of 40 feet and a width of some 200 feet at the shelving sandstone crest.

The decaying vegetation of the vast Tahquamenon swamp gives the water a golden cast. In Indian language, Tahquamenon means "black waters."

The Lower Falls, about four miles downstream, is divided by an island and is a series of rapids and cascades which lower the river 43 feet into a quiet pool below. Row-

boats are available for rent to visit the island where the series of falls are best visible.

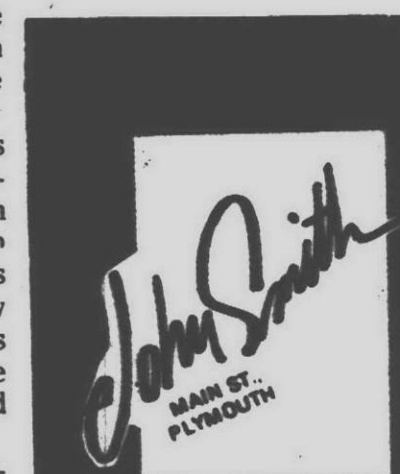
The Upper Falls can be reached by two combination boat-train trips through the wilderness.

One combination trip is called the Tom Sawyer Riverboat and Paul Bunyan Timber Train. It starts from Slater's Landing, 10 miles north of Hulbert off M-28, by riverboat and continues through the wilderness to the Falls by open air cars pulled by a huge tractor.

The other is the Toonerville Trolley and boat trip. Starting at Soo Junction, on M-28 east of Newberry, visitors ride a narrow gauge railroad six miles through thick forest and then board a riverboat for the remainder of the trip.

Either trip will give a side view of the Upper Falls better than from the opposite bank where motorists walk after parking.

From July 1 through Labor Day, there are two trips daily, at 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. After Labor Day through Oct. 10 there is one trip daily, at 10:30 a.m.

## O'Neil Attacks Proposal On Appointments

James O'Neil, vice president of the State Board of Education, has attacked a proposal to appoint state board members saying it would inject "more politics" in education and increase the danger of state control.

Under the current system, candidates for the state board and major university board are nominated at partisan conventions and elected by a statewide vote in November elections.

O'Neil, a Livonia Republican, said he would support electing state board members and university trustees in a spring education election when local school boards are elected.

"This would insure proper attention to the education issues and candidates as well as minimizing the costs," O'Neil said. "In addition, it would reduce the confusion and problems currently being experienced by voters with the bedsheet ballots."

O'Neil cautioned that appointment of state board members would have a precedent-setting effect which "could lead to the appointment of local board members by mayors and bring in more politics into education."

## Transit Competition Initiated

The Michigan Public Transportation Council has invited cities to participate in

a "New Transit" project by submitting a proposal for an efficient transit program.

The council has allocated \$400,000 for the preliminary design and engineering of the proposal which best utilizes new technology to move people through congested urban areas.

The council has suggested that cities, local or regional transportation agencies team up with private firms which have mass transit expertise in developing their proposal.

The council said it will consider several things in selecting the project, including evidence of broad-based support for the project, and demonstration that the proposed people-mover can be integrated with the local transportation system.

Other considerations include good probability that the new system will attract a higher than average volume of passengers; evidence that it will have a desirable impact on areas such as land use, environment and life styles of local citizens; and submission of plans for a project which is functional and attractive.

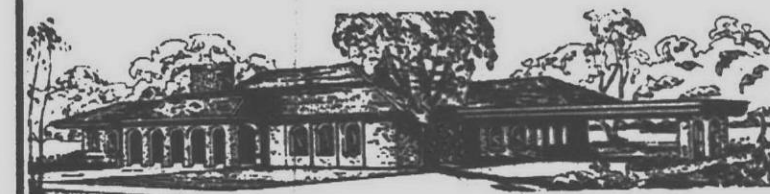

# 'Tight Money' Pinch Felt By Home Buyers

U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor), whose district includes Livonia and Plymouth, has asked Chairman Wright Patman of the House Banking and Currency Committee to hold hearings on the increasing difficulty of home buyers across the country in obtaining mortgage money.

Patman has said that he will hold hearings on the credit crunch early in September. Esch also has asked Secretary James Lynn of Housing and Urban Development, as well as chairman of the Federal National Mortgage Assn. to conduct a full investigation of the problem.

Esch said the fact that banks have no money available is not through any fault of their own, but has occurred from a deliberate policy of the Federal Reserve

Board to increase the cost of investment funds to cool business expansion and to reduce the rate of inflation.

"Unfortunately, this policy is a two-edged sword, with the major burden falling on the housing market," Esch said.

He said at the moment, efforts are being made by the Federal Home Loan Bank Board, and the Federal National Mortgage Assn. to make as much mortgage money available as possible. But the institutions are also limited because they must compete in the limited financial market.

"In the months ahead I will be working to shift the burden of the federal government's anti-inflationary policy away from the home buyer and seller," Esch said.

# Shutters Regulate Light, Air, Privacy

Does the thought of re-doing a room leave you cold?

Don't shudder. Shutter. Movable wood shutters are taking their place at windows and doorways as a popular decorative accent for any room in the house.

The "shutter look" is elegant, yet suitable as either formal or casual decor. And, movable shutters allow regulation of light, air, privacy or views virtually at the flick of a wrist.

Movable shutters are actually operating louvers. Used over windows, they generally cover the entire glass area and take the place of old-fashioned shades or venetian blinds.

Shutters can also be used as pretty and practical, "pass-throughs" between

kitchen and dining areas. Shutter doors - fully-louvered or with louvers in the top half and wood panels in the bottom - make dramatic room dividers or connecting doors.

The shutters are operated by moving the louvers up or down. Slats can be set at any angle to admit varying degrees of sunshine or light, to control ventilation, to let in or shut out views, and to insure privacy.

A special advantage is that privacy is possible without closing off all light and air. Some shutter styles fold back like an accordion to uncover a scene or open a pass-through.

Various wood shutter styles are available in stock sizes of ponderosa pine at home

centers and local lumber dealers.

Esthetically, movable wood shutters have a distinct advantage over curtains or shades. They give walls a trim, uncluttered look, and when completely closed have the appearance of rich wood paneling.

Shutters can be painted; but are especially effective when stained to highlight the natural wood grain.

## Grows On Trees

Forests poured nearly \$3 billion into the Oregon - Washington economy in 1971, estimates the Industrial Forestry Association, Portland. They provided 143,500 jobs and \$1.25 billion in wages. And timber is renewable.

### Pest Of The Week

Maple, particularly Norway and its varieties such as Crimson King, are showing damage from wind desiccation. High winds dry out the leaf tissue more rapidly than the root can replace the water.

It varies from brown patches in the centers of the leaves to browning leaf edges as in typical leaf scorch cases. The condition is complicated by compacted soil or extremely light (sand) or very heavy (clay) soil.

A number of other plants are suffering from the same problems this year in spite of the large amount of rain.

CONTROL: Unless the condition occurs for a number of years or large numbers of leaves are destroyed, no harm to the tree will result. Control of insects such as aphids and leafhoppers with appropriate sprays will help.

Root feed trees and shrubs next spring before new growth begins to develop a better root system.

## Canning Tips For Low-Acid Vegetables

With food prices on the rise, many homemakers are canning for the first time, says Marilyn Mook, Michigan State University food and nutrition specialist. Canning is an excellent method of preserving fresh garden vegetables so they can be enjoyed year round. However, some of the old-time canning methods are not recommended today.

Low-acid vegetables (all vegetables except tomatoes and pickles) should be processed under pressure. If improperly processed, low-acid vegetables could contain botulism toxin. The high temperatures reached under pressure will destroy the botulism toxin, and the canned vegetables will be safe to eat.

Low-acid vegetables may be processed in a pressure canner or cooker.

**Garden Chatter**

One pound tomatoes? Merely run-of-the-mill in this summer of '73 area gardens.

**The Green Thumb**

You've been dreaming about a greenhouse for years, but think you can't afford it? Why not consider a window greenhouse?

It can make any window a year-round garden "room." Such a structure can be installed without mutilating the window frame or sash because they're built to fit the opening and rests upon the sill. You can heat and ventilate the window greenhouse from the adjoining room—merely by opening the sash.

With a minimum of effort and expense, you can have that window greenhouse by using a tough, weatherable, plastic instead of glass. We prefer glass because it looks better on the window.

A solar window greenhouse makes any window come alive. You can get one all ready made of aluminum, in your choice of three colors: silver, gray, white and dark bronze, baked-on for permanent, life time beauty. Even an unhandy man or woman can put the solar window greenhouse together in five minutes. The only tool you need is a screwdriver to fasten the greenhouse to your window.

If you have a pair of windows side by side you can use two solar greenhouse windows. Greenhouse companies make the window greenhouses in 12 money-saving standard sizes that will fit most windows. If you have an odd size one, custom sizes are available.

To heat your greenhouse window, just open the house window in winter. Heat from your home will keep the greenhouse warm. In real cold areas, you'd better install a small electric heater. These can be purchased - size 10½x5x3¼ inches and they have a built in thermostat and fan to boost the average-size window greenhouse temperature 20 to 30 degrees.  "Please tell us how to tell when winter squash or pumpkins can be harvested."

Answer: These can be harvested when the rind of the fruit cannot be penetrated by the thumbnail. Fruit should be harvested before heavy frost since they are injured by cold temperatures. Cut the stem from the vine. Fruit without a stem will not store well.

Muskmelons pass prime eating quality rapidly. A mature melon will easily come off the vine with a gentle pull - this is called the "slip stage." Chill melons before serving. Slightly immature melons can be ripened by holding them at room temperatures.

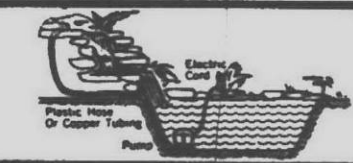

# Dahlia Gardens To Be On View

"Dahlias are a man's flower," said Arthur Rocheleau as he showed a visitor the gorgeous dahlias he has growing behind his house on Inkster Road in Redford.

"Perhaps it's because the plants, themselves, are large and heavy. Perhaps it's because the flowers are so big and spectacular."

Whatever the reason, men do enjoy growing these plants and the majority of the 75 members of the South-eastern Michigan Dahlia Society are men.

Rocheleau's garden is in full bloom and is one of three open to the public for a tour

sponsored by the society on Sunday, Sept. 23.

The Rocheleau's garden is open starting at 3:30 p.m. The address is 16212 Inkster Road between Five Mile and Six Mile Rd.

Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Gies's garden, 9206 Riverdale, Detroit, (east of Telegraph between Joy and W. Chicago), is on view at 1:30 and Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Trute's garden, 24246 Norfolk, Detroit (west of Telegraph between Seven and Eight Mile Rd.), is open at 2:30.

Arthur Rocheleau estimates that he has over 50 different varieties in his garden. He has little miniatures and medium sized ones, and great huge dahlias with flo-

wers over a foot across.

Some have shaggy, mop-like heads. Others have petals so precisely formed and placed they look like tiles on a roof. Some have flat petals. Others have petals rolled into tubes or quills.

His favorite is a pink one called Surprise. He also has a special fondness for a large orange and white bi-color known as Holland Festival, and for a spirtly little one called Johnny Casey which looks like an oversized red and white peppermint candy.

"Arthur Godfrey is the big red one with bronze," pointed out Rocheleau, "and this one here is Richard Rodgers. There's Dottie D, and Grace and that red one over there is Uchuu from Japan."

As he talked Mr. Rocheleau pulled a length of cord from his back pocket and tied a floppy plant more securely to a stake.

Each plant is fastened to a tall green stake. Many plants are four or five feet tall, and have flowers that are bigger than a dinner plate. To keep the stems straight and the huge flowers from bending down, staking is an important and necessary part of their culture.

Mrs. Rocheleau, who enjoys the dahlias, too, admired some medium sized plants with deep pink blooms, and almost automatically as she looked at the plants she pinched off some of the small side buds.

When questioned about this, she explained that as she checks the plants she does this disbudding, as it is called, so that the main flower grows extra large. It is a process that many growers use to develop huge blooms that they can enter in com-

petition in shows and exhib-

its. Rocheleau, who has claimed many ribbons and awards for his dahlias, began growing them about ten years ago. He recalls that at first he had no success at all. He planted his first dahlia tubers in the shade beneath a tree. When they didn't produce any flowers he pulled them out and threw them in the trash.

Fortunately, his next door neighbor, who had more gardening experience, noticed his plight, and proceeded to give him some horticultural advice. Since then the Rocheleau's dahlias have been thriving.

They have done so well, that gradually the Rocheleaus have devoted more and more space - and time - to them. Even their vegetable garden, a large rectangular plot that occupies

over a quarter of the yard, has now been converted to a dahlia bed.

The first dahlias Rocheleau grew were inexpensive, unnamed "cheapsies." Each year he has upgraded the collection and bought better varieties. Now only the choicest kinds are grown - each a potential prize-winner. Many new varieties can cost as much as \$15 a piece he explains.

In a few years when supplies become plentiful the same ones may sell for only \$2. However, dahlia fanciers who are always looking for something new and better to exhibit seek out the expensive new kinds.

Dahlias, which are natives of Mexico, are not winter hardy in our area. The tubers from which they grow must be stored in a frost-free place in the winter.

Rocheleau brings his out of

storage around the first of April. He carefully divides the clumps, making sure that each resulting division has several "eyes" or buds from which the stems will sprout.

He starts these into growth in his garage under a fluorescent light above a work table. The tubers are spread out on trays filled with a thin layer of soil. As the sprouts begin to grow, Rocheleau can check to see which are sturdy looking and which are "duds" that aren't growing at all.

Sometime around the first of October Rocheleau will dig up all the dahlia tubers. This will amount to six or seven bushels of tubers. To avoid mix-ups, the proper tag is removed from the stakes and wired to each clump as it is dug up.

## More Schools Settle For Flat Pay Hikes

## An Observer Roundup

Contract settlements among teachers in local school districts appear to be setting a new pattern as teachers settle for flat across the board salary increases.

In recent years, teachers have generally settled for contracts with smaller percentages increase at the bottom of the seniority scale and higher percentages at the top.

In Farmington, Southfield and Redford Union have settled for across-the-board increases plus increments.

Teachers in Garden City and Clarenceville settled for the smaller percentage at the bottom of the scale and larger at the top.

Livonia and South Redford teacher groups are still negotiating. Teachers in Plymouth and Wayne - Westland are entering the final year of multi-year contracts and thus weren't faced with negotiations this year.

Southfield teachers recently settled for a five per cent across-the-board salary hike plus increments. This brought the total increase to nine per cent.

Increases are automatic salary increases based on length of service and increased education.

Southfield signed a two-year agreement which provides for a minimum across-the-board increase of three per cent and a maximum

of six per cent in the second year. The exact percentage will depend on the increase in the consumer price index.

Although Farmington teachers haven't ratified their contract, the agreement calls for a 5.6 per cent increase plus increments.

The three-year contract calls for a cost of living increase between 3.5 and six per cent in the second and third years.

Redford Union teachers reached agreement on a one-year contract calling for a flat five per cent increase plus increments.

In contrast, teachers from Garden City and Clarenceville didn't settle for general percentage increases.

After a four-day strike, Garden City teachers agreed on a one-year contract calling for 5.95 per cent increase for beginners with bachelor degrees and a 7.62 increase for veterans with master's.

Clarenceville's agreement averages 7.3 per cent but varies for teachers depending on where they are in the increment scale.

The salary improvement averages 4.7 per cent while increments average 2.6 per cent.

Salaries for Clarenceville teachers at the first step in the scale will increase this year from \$8,500 to \$8,600, or nearly 1.2 per cent. Those at the top of the scale will receive 4.3 per cent increases from \$16,300 to \$17,000.

# Canton Blitzed, 25-0

Plymouth Canton football fortunes have only one way to go — up.

And despite the fact that the Chiefs were shut out 25-0 by Grosse Ile in their varsity debut, Coach Jim Muneio has reason to believe the wait won't be long.

Class B Canton of the Western Six, Observerland's newest interscholastic entry, has only ninth, 10th and 11th graders. Yet, in the Grosse Ile non-league opener, Canton took on one of the key contenders for the Huron League crown. Last autumn, the Red Devils were 5-4 and they started 10 seniors and one junior against Canton.

Had it not been for a fleet .00.9 Grosse Ile sprinter named Fritz Jackson, the traditional fun provided by a full September moon, pretty cheerleaders and the renowned Plymouth band which combines musicians from both high schools, the

night might just have been accompanied by a first-time-ever Canton gridiron varsity victory.

But the 180-pound Red Devil, a senior who was all-league last fall, cast a pall over the moon and the rest of opening night fanfare with brilliant touchdown dashes of 50, 62 and 61 yards — all in the first half. In fact, he got the first two before the game was seven minutes old and then clicked on the 81-yarder just before intermission.

This third one was the TD that broke Canton's back, for only moments before the Chiefs had driven to the Grosse Ile one-yard line, but had failed to score while trailing, 13-0.

A touchdown there could have sent them into the half-time respite trailing perhaps no worse than 13-7; instead, the board read 19-0 at the half and it became a different tactical game. For the record, Grosse Ile got one



more score on a 14-yard burst by Tim Cortis late in the final quarter.

So where does Muneio find his optimism as the Chiefs prepare for their second test, which will come Friday afternoon, at Dearborn Heights Annapolis — a team which itself was beaten 26-6 by Oak Park in the opener?

Partially from the fact that his club put together five second half first downs against Grosse Ile's two, and

twice stopped the Red Devils inside the Plymouth 20.

Partially from an over-all stout defensive performance against more experienced talent, particularly by linemen such as Dave Edwards, Mike Verduce and Jim Moore.

Partially from a display of offensive cohesion that he found in the drive to within 36 inches of the goal led by the stabs of Mike Ogden, Kimmy Hammonds, Jeff

Young, Bob Ayotte and Scott Dunagan.

Partially from knowledge that this week he can go all the way with his No. 1 quarterback, Tom Close, who played only briefly Friday after missing most of the week's practices because of a throat infection. Then, too, this enabled the back-up field general, Brian Stemberger, to gain combat seasoning not otherwise available.

Partially because first-game pressure is now behind these kids.

And finally, because Muneio feels it is almost impossible that any football team, no matter how inexperienced, can possibly fumble 12 times two weeks in a row!

In brief, while the jittery Chiefs weren't good, they weren't all that bad either. And there's one other thing going for Muneio as he looks into the crystal ball of the Canton future: He's the only coach in the Western Six who will have every varsity member back for the 1974 season 12 months hence.

In came Birney, who last year toppled Bishop Gallagher with a 41 yarder, and he made good on the three point play and Borgess was the victor.

Rice collected 12 first downs to 11 by Borgess and also won the passing game, 119 yards to 97, hitting on seven of 13 compared to four of six by Drypen for Borgess.

Borgess did outrush Rice, 165 to 148, with Kelly collecting 121 yards in 20 carries to compliment his two interceptions on defense.

## Turf Tips, Quips

The combination of the Michigan Mile and the Detroit Race Course has long been known as the "graveyard of champions" and more often than not victory has gone to a longshot.

Thus it wasn't that much of a surprise when Golden Don, who rated so low in the mind of Racing Secretary Norris Gwinn that he was placed in the mutuel field for wagering purposes and shared No. 12 in the mutuel numbers, stormed through the stretch to outduel the even money favorite Tri Jet for an amazing victory.

Golden Don, who was 14th and last as the field neared the halfway point in the mile and an eighth race, didn't appear much of a threat at that time.

That's when Jockey Mike Manganello took to the outside and let the horse loose. Meanwhile, Tri Jet had fought off the challenges of Canadian Jeff and Aljajim to take the lead as the horses turned into the long stretch.

The favorite opened up a length and a half and appeared headed for an easy triumph. Then suddenly coming up on the outside was Golden Don, a three-year-old who had finished five lengths behind Tri Jet in the \$124,720 Hawthorne Gold Cup in Chicago two weeks ago.

The sophomore was really rocketing, taking ground-eating long strides that had him breathing down the neck of the leader some 50 yards from the finish line.

Then suddenly he zipped past, opened up three lengths and went under the wire an easy winner. Tri Jet was second and had 2 1/2 lengths on third place Aljajim.

As a member of the mutuel field Golden Jet went off at better than 11-1 odds and the thoroughly shocked crowd moaned when the board flashed a price of \$25.60 for a \$2 win ticket.

That is most of the crowd groaned except the longshot bettors who screamed their delight at picking another big priced winner of the Mile.

Golden Don was clocked in 1:48.3 for the race, two full

seconds over the stake and track record.

The result brought back memories of past Miles when Michigan - owned Stanislas went off at better than 21-1 and upset Tom Rolfe, the three-year-old champion of 1965, in the 1966 renewal.

Then there was the 1963 renewal when Crimson Satan, owned by Livonia Industrialist Peter Salmen, whizzed past Decidly, the 1962 Kentucky Derby winner, for a DRC record clocking of 1:40.3 for the mile and a sixteenth. This year's 25th anniversary honored Crimson Satan.

Then came 1964 when South America's Tibaldo II and the Chicago colt Going Abroad slopped through the heavy going for a dead heat. It was the first time such a rich take wound up with the two leaders perfectly nose to nose.

In 1967, Stanislas was trying for an encore against such standouts as Abe's Hope, Williamston Kid and Handsome Boy. But the winner was Estreno II, another South American which paid \$250.60 to win.

In 1968, Damascus, three-year-old king of 1967, was rated the top handicap horse in the land. But it was No Double coming through with a brilliant stretch drive who whipped the champ by more than a length.

That's the kind of race the Mile has been through the years... thus it didn't come as that much of a surprise when Golden Don won Saturday. The thing that amazed most veteran followers of the sport was the tremendous speed of the colt in the long stretch. Had the race been a bit longer, it would have won by as much as five lengths... that's how fast it was coming.

The Mile attracted a crowd of 17,078, largest attendance of the year in metropolitan Detroit, and the handle soared to \$11,640,065, also a season high in Michigan. This compared to 20,007 and \$1,793,294 a year ago.

From the other side of the city, Hazel Park continues its record making fall harness racing meeting. But those who have been watching the scene for years believe the east side plant has lost any chance of hitting a million dollar night this season.

The best chances came on the Labor Day weekend and the following Saturday, the track passed \$900,000 each time but didn't come close to the much sought million dollars.

Matter of fact no Michigan harness racing track has come close to that magic figure in a fall meet. Thus it appears Hazel Park will pass the hurdle more than once next spring and Wolverine Raceway will have its troubles trying to make it in the fall.

Perhaps if the racing commissioner decided to give the two big tracks back - to - back meetings next summer, then each may hit a million several times.

After an exchange of punts, West was caught deep in its zone and fumbled on its own four with Franklin's Todd Mapes pouncing on the

loose ball. Quarterback Casey completed the score with a spurt around right end, Quinn made good the conversion and with 6:28 remaining in the half, Franklin was up, 16-6.

The second quarter saw West slice it to 16-12. Carr intercepted a stray Casey pass and Tiger QB Terry Dobbs whipped a 42 yard toss to Bill

Underwood. A two - pointer failed and it stood 16-12 at the half.

There was no scoring in the third quarter with Franklin breaking back into the scoring column in the fourth.

A nine yard punt by West gave Franklin possession on the Tiger 39. The Pats marched the distance in seven plays with Greg Battistone taking it in from 14

yards out. Quinn converted and the score was 23-12, with 2:54 remaining.

A nine yard Dobbs to Mike Calamita pass cut it to 23-18 with 1:44 left.

Franklin collected 13 first downs to 12 by West and outrushed the Tigers, 183 to 75. West hit on 13 of 23 passes for 141 yards while Franklin made good seven of 14 for 76 yards.

Battistone pounded out 87 yards in 14 carries and Quinn 75 yards in 14 carries to pace the Franklin attack which also collected 115 yards in penalties in 11 calls.

## One Second Left, Stevenson Wins

A six yard touchdown pass from Mark Temby to Ray Davis with one second remaining spelled the difference in a Stevenson come from behind victory over Redford Union, 14-12.

It was the seventh meeting between the two rival clubs with Stevenson now holding a 4-3 edge.

"It was a tough one to lose," said RU Coach Bob Atkins whose squad finished 6-3 last year after dropping the opener to the Spartans, 18-7. "Our kids had that game won for 47 minutes and 59 seconds."

"We just lost," concluded Atkins.

On the first play from scrimmage, Bogdonas broke loose for 47 yards and six points for RU.

Another Stevenson drive was halted by an interception, this one a 65 yard march that included 15 plays and the half ended in a 6-0 score.

Stevenson power pushed the ball to the RU seven early in the third but the Panther line kept the Spartans in check. On the second play after taking control of the ball, RU fumbled on the nine and Lulek plunged to the one where Mark Temby dashed in. Bob Hope made good the conversion and Stevenson had a 7-6 margin.

RU bounced back on a 58 yard punt return in the

fourth. A two-point effort missed but RU had the lead again, 12-7.

Stevenson failed to move the ball, punted to RU and with 3:42 Coach Atkins called for a play he wished he could have taken back.

Dave Smith went to the air and Davis intercepted for Stevenson on his own 25. Lulek broke loose for 25 yards. On a fourth down and nine situation, Temby hit Chuck Bien for 36 yards to the RU six with one second remaining.

Temby then hit Davis for the deciding score, Hope converted and Stevenson had again topped the Panthers.

RU travels to Allen Park Friday for its Suburban Eight opener and Stevenson plays at Franklin Saturday afternoon.

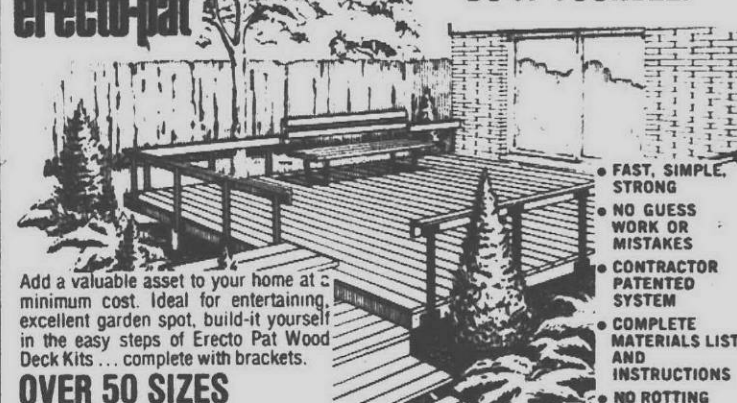

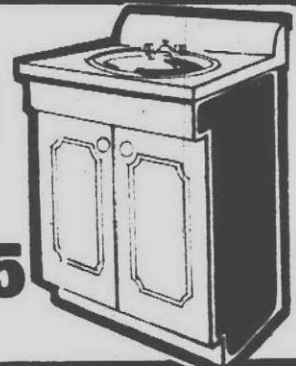

## The Stroller: Home Work Works

By W.W. EDGAR

Now that the frost is on the pumpkin and the corn is in the shock, it won't be long until we hear students— from grade schools through college—complaining about being loaded down with home work.

In most cases, students tell you that they enjoy the fellowship on the campus and the school activities— just so long as they don't have to burn the midnight oil to keep up the pace of absorbing knowledge.

Little do these moaners realize that the home work is the most important part of the preparation for the challenges that lie ahead. They don't realize that it is the best prepared fellow who climbs the ladder of success when his school days end.

### Canton Board Endorses Huron Sewer

These moaners will learn to their sorrow that one of the highest compliments they can be paid when meeting the challenges of every day living is to be rated as a fellow "who does his home work."

While The Stroller was listening to one of these moaners the other evening— even before school started— he couldn't help recalling some of the great examples he has seen along the way.

One prime example of modern times was the manner in which Joe Louis, who once "hustled" axles at Ford, climbed the fistic ladder to the heavyweight championship of the world.

When Joe started his boxing campaign, he was inclined to depend almost entirely on his right hand for punching. To offset this, his trainers took a very drastic step. They wrapped his right hand to his body, then tied him into the corner of the ring and made him fend off his sparring partners with his left fist.

For a time, Joe moaned and protested. But in the end, he stuck to the task and finally earned acclaim as the best two-fisted fighter in the game.

It was the same with the development of his body. In his amateur days, Joe never had to fight what is termed a body puncher. His trainers in the pro ranks feared for the day he might oppose a fellow with the style of a Jack Dempsey who would stress a body attack.

To offset the possibility of defeat from his angle, Joe's handlers had him stand erect with his hands down every afternoon in the gym while his sparring partners continually pounded a heavy medicine ball at his stomach. This paid big dividends, for Joe never was even slightly damaged by punches to the body.

His "home work" paid off. Hank Greenberg, the Tiger first baseman in the pennant winning days of the 1930s, is another great example. Switched from first base to

the outfield before the 1937 campaign began, he spent hour after hour in the hot Florida sun while the natives batted balls to him from all sides. While other players finished for the day, Hank would spend his afternoons learning to play balls hit off the walls.

It was an arduous task. But when the season opened, he was ready. He, too, had done his homework.

One of the most famous cases is Ty Cobb, still rated the best baseball player of all time.

During his first year with the Tigers as a young rookie,

he suffered the fate of striking out three times one afternoon against "Doc" White, a left hander with the Chicago White Sox.

## Enrollment At S'craft Jumps 18%

Schoolcraft College's student enrollment has climbed 18.3 per cent so far this fall with 8,000 persons enrolled in either credit or community services classes.

The enrollment figure swelled with the expanded community services program in which persons can enroll in classes where "institutional" or non-transfer credit is given.

Enrollment for many community services classes is still open. Classes include wine appreciation, chess, handwriting analysis and courses of varying appeal. Community service class enrollment is at 1,627 this year, 77.8 per cent higher than the 915 enrollment last year.

Altogether 6,371 students are enrolled in regular college classes carrying transferable credit. This figure represents an 8.9 per cent increase over the fall 1972 enrollment of 5,848.

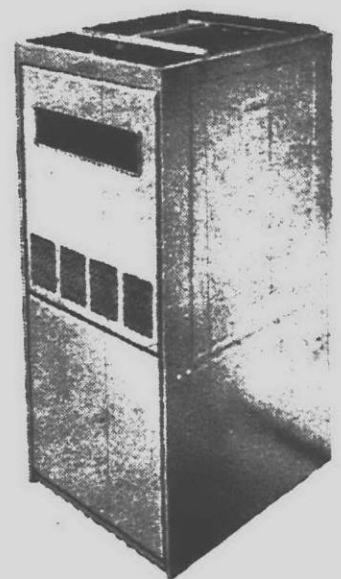

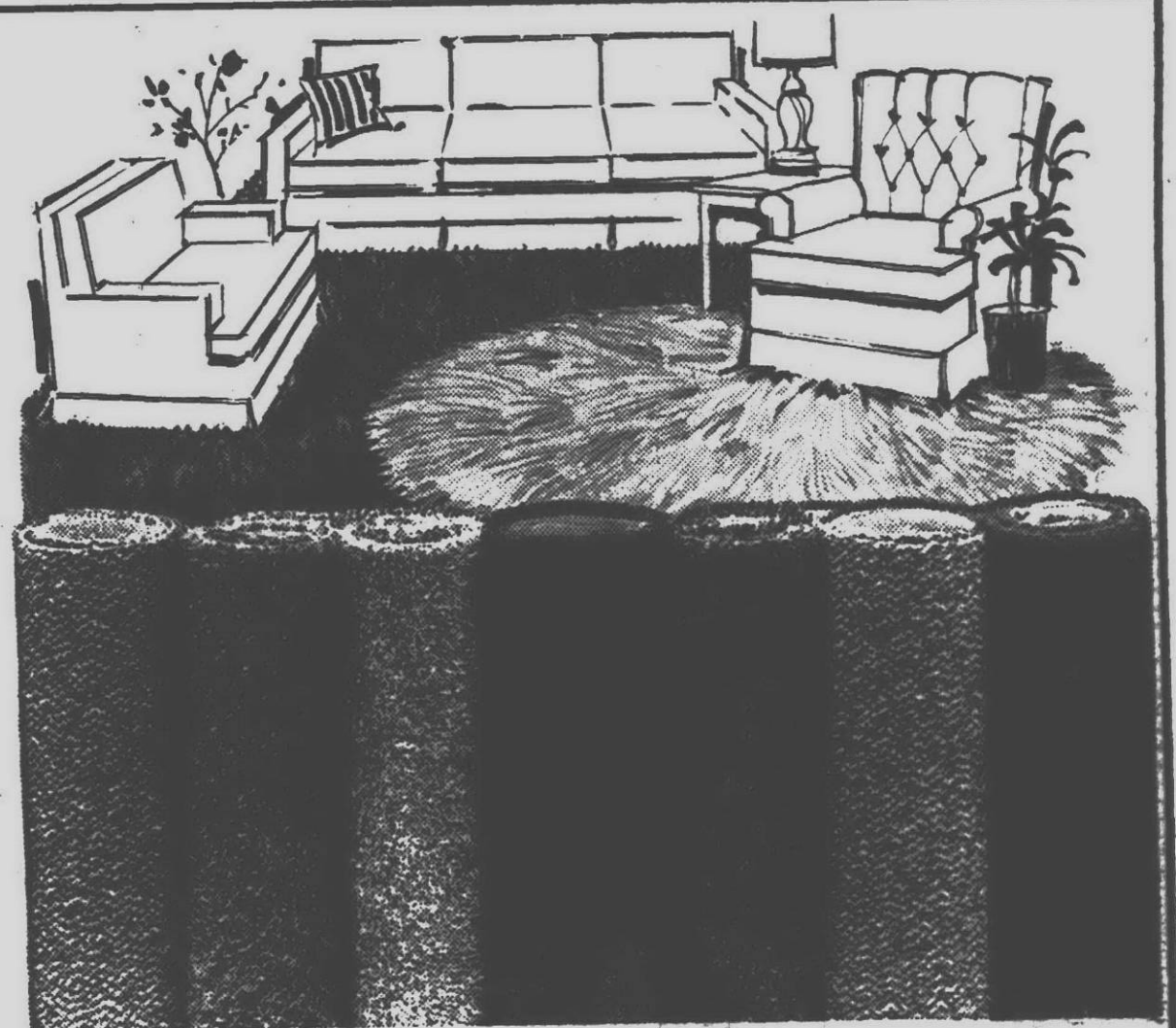

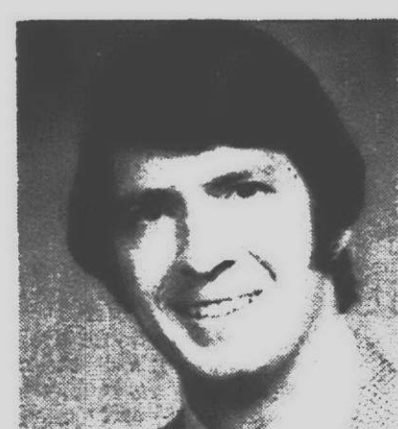

Q. What is this "CCODA" I saw in the paper a while back?

Q. What is DMT?

T.L., Livonia

A. DMT, an abbreviation for dimethyltryptamine, produces LSD-like trips and is short acting, lasting from one-half hour to four hours. DMT is a synthetic derivative of tryptamine, chemically related to psilocybin and LSD.

Use of DMT causes increased pulse and blood pressure and carries the dangers of hallucinogens in general, such as the user risking health, sanity and possibly their lives if DMT is mixed with other drugs.
