## Hayride Ends In Death, Tragedy

Police may never know exactly how many persons were involved in an accident at N. Territorial and Napier Roads Saturday night when a car crashed into a hayride trailer.

Officially, police list two dead and 14 injured, but witnesses say that following the accident others who were not seriously injured or escaped injury walked back to the house where the hayride had started following a party.

Police say their investigation is continuing although neither of the drivers involved had been arrested or ticketed as of Monday.

The husband of one woman injured seriously was "detained for his safety and ours," the sheriff's spokesman said, but he was not arrested.

Dead are: Charles Wayne Leasure, 34, of 408 N. Linville, Westland; and Johnny Lee Ball, 29, of 315 Roe, Plymouth. They were pronounced dead on arrival at

University Hospital in Ann Arbor.

The sheriff's report said a total of 14 persons were on the hay wagon, but one witness said there were many more.

Marie Bell, whose husband, John, died in the crash, told The Observer there were "maybe 30 people" on the wagon although some had got off at the corner as the car and wagon were about to turn.

"There were just too many people on the wagon," she said.

After some of them

jumped off, the car and wagon started out onto North Territorial to turn around. Mrs. Bell said, "but the tire was still rubbing so we (Mrs. Bell and some of the others) got off."

As they were trying to turn the wagon around, Mrs. Bell said, one car came by at a "normal speed" and drove around the wagon.

"Then we looked, and all of us knew it, (a car coming toward us) was going too fast."

"It had its bright lights on

## Torch Lighting To Spark Fund

The 1974 Plymouth Community Fund Drive will get its official send-off at 10 a.m. Thursday in Kellogg Park when the traditional torch lighting ceremonies will take place.

Momentum of the drive will pick up from that point with a meeting of the community's industrial leaders planned for Monday night. Former Michigan State Football Coach Duffy Daugherty will be the keynote speaker at that meeting.

Leonard Evans, general chairman of this year's drive, announced that the goal of the 1973-74 effort is \$194,800 — some \$13,000 over last year's goal.

The total goal includes the following quotas set for the seven units of the drive: industrial, \$146,000; business, \$18,400; residential, \$7,000; special gifts and clubs, \$4,000; professional, \$6,800; educational, \$10,500; and governmental, \$2,100.

Chairmen for each of those areas have also been appointed for this year's drive. They are: industrial, Ralph Brown; business, Bud Schrader; residential, Mrs. Gloria Holphner; special gifts and clubs, Dick Wickard; professional, Edward Draugelis; educational, John M. Hoben; and governmental, Ray Quada.

Volunteers working on the residential campaign met Tuesday morning to plan their campaign of door-bell ringing which will begin on Oct. 8.

Weekly reports on the drive's progress will be given until the Nov. 16 "victory dinner."

## Could The Tragedy Have Been Avoided?

We were watching the end of the Saturday night movie when we heard the crash and the screaming.

It would seem that having seen hundreds of accident photos and a fair share of accidents, you'd be used to such things.

But we were hardly prepared for the scene we came upon following the accident that so tragically ended a hayride on a beautiful night.

It was a sight we won't forget for a long time.

There were people wandering around screaming and crying. There were bodies lying in the road, amid the tangled wreckage of the two cars and hay wagon.

We tried to help the injured as much as we could — it was all anybody could do.

It took some time just to find somebody who was hurt and to determine which ones were the worst.

We never were able to tell at the scene how many



people were involved but learned later two had died and 14 were injured, according to the official reports.

But several of those riding the hay wagon who weren't injured, or less seriously so, had apparently walked down the road back to where the party had started out.

When my wife called the sheriff, they asked her how many people were hurt, how many ambulances they should send.

We couldn't tell — it was all so confusing with the screaming and the crying.

It was hard to believe the hayride which had slowly

passed by our house only moments before the crash with the people laughing and yelling, having a good time, had ended in such a nightmare.

As others arrived at the scene to help, we tried to calm everybody, with little success.

One woman, who knelt beside her husband while holding his head in her lap, kept asking, "Is he dead? Is he dead?"

His head was bloodied, his body twisted — but at the time he was breathing. We could see his breath in the chilly air.

I found out he died later.



FOLLOWING THE CRASH, Jeff Grundy (photo at left) rushed to the scene to find his wife, Linda, seriously injured and his cousin, John L. Bell, dead. Seeing police frisking a man (who police arrested but said was not involved in the accident) Grundy leaped over the trunk of a car toward him. Washtenaw sheriff deputies handcuffed Grundy "for his safety and ours" but did not arrest him.

# Minimum Wage Veto Upheld

## An Observer Roundup

U.S. Reps. William Ford (D-Taylor) and Martha Griffiths (D-Detroit) voted to override President Nixon's veto of the minimum wage bill in a futile effort to boost the minimum wage.

U.S. Rep. Marvin Eash (R-Ann Arbor) voted to uphold the veto, thus helping kill the bill. The attempt to override the veto failed 259-164, or 23 votes short of the two-thirds majority needed.

The president vetoed the bill saying it would increase unemployment and add to inflationary pressures. Currently the minimum wage is \$1.60 per hour. The bill would have increased it to \$2 this year and \$2.20 next year.

An Eash spokesman said the congressman voted to support the veto although he didn't agree with the president's appraisal of the bill.

He said that Eash supports the minimum wage in general but wanted a youth differential provision included in the bill to give youths between the ages of 16 and 19 a different wage scale.

Eash says that the largest percentage of unemployment occurs in that age range, reaching as high as 35 per cent in some areas.

He believes that if youths

are paid on a different and lower scale, they will be able to obtain jobs which might not be available to them otherwise.

He also disagreed with a minimum overtime provision in the bill which he says may force state and local governments to raise their taxes.

Eash said he will introduce a new minimum wage bill including similar provisions but with the youth differential provision included.

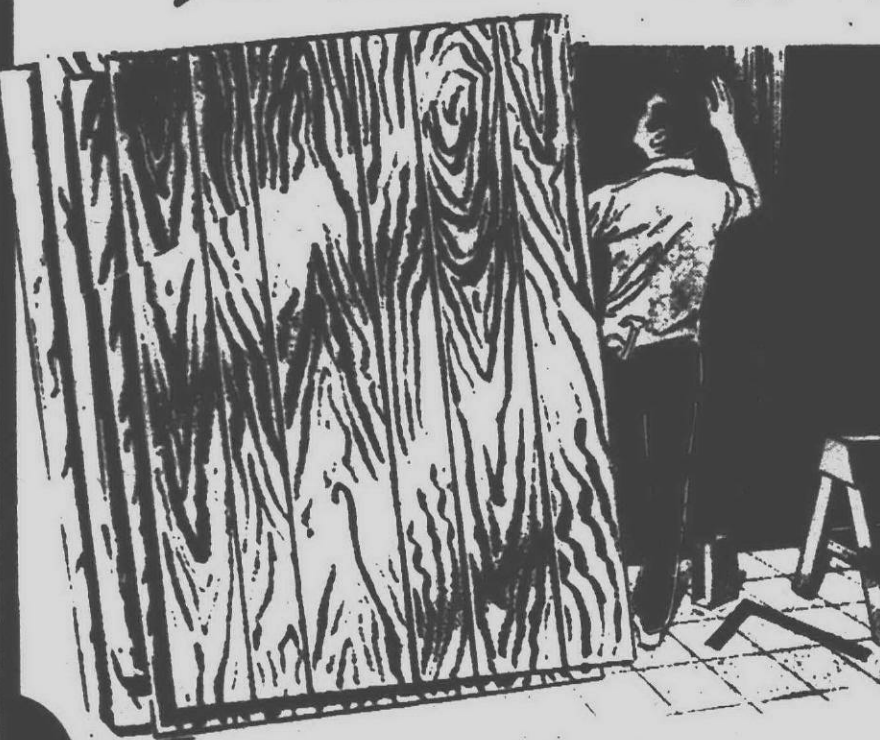

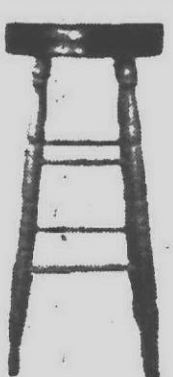

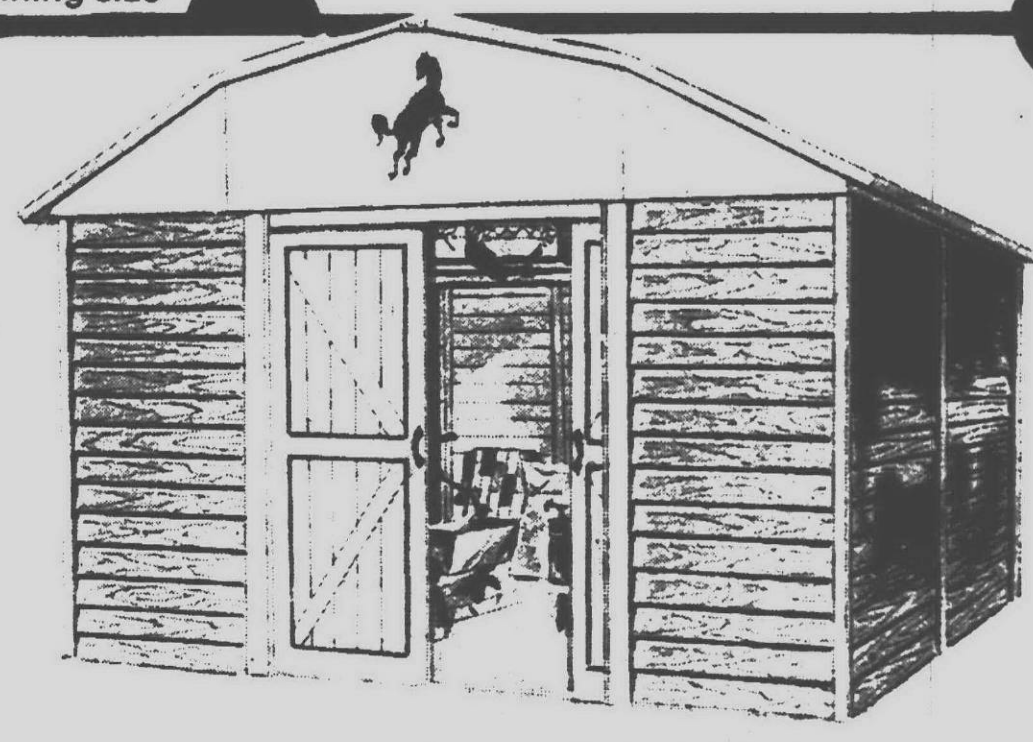

PLYMOUTH Plymouth high school students faced several changes when they walked in the doors for classes Thursday, Sept. 6. Among these were changes in the modular system, addition of a traditional schedule, and a new attendance policy.

Probably the most apparent changes were those involving modular scheduling. First, the modules (periods) were increased from 15 to 20 minutes. This decision was made by Centennial Educational Park administrators last spring due to the computer scheduling problems and conflicts.

Another change is the addi-

tion of traditional scheduling. Last year, there was a type of scheduling similar to traditional, called "structured" which was added by area coordinators.

This year, out of a board of education mandate, both modular and traditional scheduling were offered. The traditional schedule consists of five classes per day each of three mods (60 minutes) that meet six times per six day cycle. These students are given 40 minutes for lunch.

This year, all seniors (the class of 1974) have been assigned to Plymouth-Salem High School. While some seniors do have classes in Canton, and some Canton students do have classes in Salem, the independence of each school is being stressed.

The setup of the student government has been changed for the 1973-74 school year. This year, a student council presides over each building, each council

having its own executive board (mayor, vice mayor, secretary and treasurer).

Presiding over the total school complex is a student senate, consisting of representatives from both buildings, members at large and an independent executive board. The student senate takes care of matters that directly affect the entire student body, while the student councils work directly with the school they are associated with.

The new attendance policy for the high schools evolved from a conference between administrators and school board members. The policy this year puts teachers in a position to contact home after absences with the administrators being called in on problems. Also, teachers are being held accountable for their attendance record. They are also required to fill out cycle "cut slips" for the administrators' reference no later than the fourth absence.

## A Proposal To Help Save Historical Sites

As the pace of development in the suburbs accelerates, so, too, does interest in preserving what's left of the honored remains of the past.

In Livonia, the city council is still trying to figure out a way to come up with enough money to acquire the old Wilson barn, a city and state historical landmark. Plymouth residents shuddered when sale of the old Garber farm was announced, until it became fairly clear that the old farmhouse on the property would be preserved.

Civic leaders in Farmington, which is gearing up for its 150th birthday next year, are talking about how nice it would be to move some of the over 100-year-old buildings into a central area and make it into sort of Greenfield Village. The old mill at

Nankin Mills in Hines Park is throbbing with visitors.

ALL THIS interest in the past is coming at a time when the folks down in Washington are scratching about for something suitable to do in honor of the nation's 200th birthday in 1976.

You may recall that several years ago a Bicentennial Commission was launched with great fanfare. Philadelphia was designated as the key city for the celebration, and grandiose plans were put forward for expositions, historical pageants, traveling historical shows and the like.

Since then, all has collapsed. The Philadelphia committee dissolved in acrimony and lack of money; the Bicentennial Commission itself was stacked with political appointees who seemed more interested in making sure their business interests were

better served than the 200th anniversary of our country. About the only proposal that got much publicity, and that, too, was one to put out special red, white and blue Coke bottles for the occasion.

Since then, silence on the bicentennial. I assume something is being planned on the federal level, but given the government's certain propensity to louse up anything given it, I really don't expect too much more than large numbers of helium-filled balloons.

WHICH BRINGS ME back to the folks in this area who are working so hard to try to preserve a little bit of our nation's past before it's bulldozed by the pace of development.

Their major problem is lack of money. For example, it seems that the value of the Wilson barn and land in Livonia is around \$200,000, and that's a lot of money for even a big city to come up with.

Since the national Bicentennial folks don't seem to have come up with much more than red, white and blue Coke bottles, why not have a major part of the national program be in direct grants to communities for the preservation of historical structures?

Such a program would have a number of advantages. It would honor our nation's past, provide a lasting monument instead of boring windy celebration speeches, be under local control, meet a real need, and reduce the kind of inappropriate showbiz merchandising mentality that seems to have taken over the Bicentennial planners.

Of course it would be expensive. One million dollars to each state is \$50 million, but my guess is that at least twice that sum will be spent for the national celebration with nothing left afterward to show for it. That's a good buy these days.

## Same Slow Service To Cost More

Judging from Washington reports, the cost of mailing a letter will soar to 10 cents next January if a proposed across-the-board increase is approved by the Postal Rate Commission.

That's the plan of Postmaster General Elmer T. Klassen, who has sought such an increase for almost a year but has done little or nothing to better the mail service at the same time.

Klassen has a big job ahead. First he must sell the increase to the PRS which in turn must recommend approval by the board of governors of the U.S. Postal Service. The last mentioned has the final say...that is, assuming the Cost of Living Council doesn't object.

If the Cost of Living Council does object, and it might well in this instance, then the proposed increases may go down the drain.

The proposed across-the-board hikes would include a boost in air mail costs from 11 to 13 cents, an increase of 28 per cent for second class mail, 25 per cent for third class and six per cent for fourth class parcel post.

All of which could possibly result in increased subscription rates for magazines and all other publications, a hike in the costs of all newspapers received through the mail, and a boost in the charges for mailing packages.

In the initial analysis, the first thought was that the Postal Service was boosting costs at a time when the mail volume would climb by as much as 40 to 50 per cent...we are referring to the annual Christmas card and gift package rush. Everyone knows of the way the mail backs up in the two or three weeks ahead of the biggest holiday of the year.

But Klassen is trying to get the increase approved to take effect in early January. At least he had sense enough not to ruffle people at a time when they know, and he knows, expenses will be the highest of the entire year.

Once again it's time for folks to take a good look at the mail service picture and determine for themselves whether Klassen has good reasons for his proposals or whether he's asking a lot for little in return.

Those in the communities covered by the Observer Newspapers are well aware that mail deliveries have gone backward for the past several years.

Gone are the days when a person could mail a letter in Plymouth on Monday and know it would arrive in Livonia on Tuesday. Gone are the days when one could put a check in the mails in the suburbs and know it would

be in Detroit on time for payment the next day.

Despite the installation of the zip codes, which were to expedite delivery, it takes two and more often than not three days for a letter mailed in the Farmington post office to arrive in Garden City.

So for service like this, the American public is going to have to pay 38 per cent more. One knows without

waiting the increase will get back to the readers' pocketbooks.

The poor delivery is not the fault of the mail carriers who try to speed up service as much as possible but can't because of the system. The system was devised by Klassen who was made postmaster general because of his industrial background where he reportedly gained a reputation for efficiency and

in speeding up operations.

It's time for the public to take a hand in the matter and protest any increases in postal rates unless there is a guaranteed promise of better service.

Ten cents today compared to three cents years ago, and overnight delivery then compared to two and three days now...that's a lot of money to pay for nothing new and no improvements.

## Deserved Honors For Warner

It was gratifying to students of history to see the Farmington Board of Education name a new junior high school for Fred M. Warner, one of only two Observerland residents ever to serve as governor of Michigan.

The only unfortunate thing was that Farmington built 27 other schools before naming one for its most prominent political son.

Warner was more than just another man of affairs moving through the chairs of public life. His administration (1905-10) established the first state highway department, built the first mile of concrete road, began the regulation of railroads and insurance companies, established workmen's compensation and founded what is now Western Michigan University.

A merchant and cheese manufacturer, Warner was Michigan's first three-term governor and first foreign-born governor (England). (John B. Swainson was born in Canada and George Romney in Mexico. Swainson, incidentally, resided awhile in Plymouth, which that school board should keep in mind if he completes his political career without scandal.)

All of which raises the question of what policies or feelings of priorities school boards use when placing a name on a building.

Redford Union and Clarenceville boards had no problem with their high schools because they're single-school districts. Garden City, split by Middle Belt Road, opted for East and West.

Livonia names its elementary schools for presidents and Supreme Court chief justices, its junior high for poets and its senior highs for generally "great" men.

So the board found itself in the perfectly ridiculous position of naming an elementary school for one of the world's greatest war heroes and a two-term president, Dwight D. Eisenhower, and a senior high for the man he beat twice by landslide margins, Adlai E. Stevenson.

The biggest job Stevenson ever held was ambassador to the United Nations, and if you think that's important, try to remember the names of his predecessor (nope, not Henry Cabot Lodge) and his successor.

If Livonia had to name a high school after a Democrat, a better choice would have been Lewis Cass, a territorial governor of Michigan who went on to the Senate and to the War Dept. portfolio and also was a Democratic presidential candidate.

In fact, Cass won more electoral votes (127) when he ran in 1848 than Stevenson got (89) 104 years later when the Electoral College had doubled in size. Yet Cass rates only an elementary.

Ignoring the likes of Copernicus, Galileo, Dalton, Steinmetz, Einstein and Von Braun, the Wayne-Westland board named a high school for John H. Glenn Jr. The first American astronaut to circle the globe in a spaceship is a fine fellow, but already his achievements have been overshadowed, and one suspects that in time his choice will seem "dated."

If some men seem prominent today, it is because they stand on the shoulders of giants of the past. And so it was good to see the Farmington school board reach back 63 years into history to name a junior high for a man who had been an alderman, mayor, state representative, secretary of state and three-time governor.

Hurrah for Fred M. Warner Junior High!

## Teachers Are Just Like Other Union Members

EDITOR:

It is interesting to note, at least at this time, that the only strikes that seem to elicit the most reaction are teacher strikes. It brings out those like Pete Waldmeier who obviously will be running for the Detroit school board soon and it brings out others who, like him, are equally uninformed.

Strikes by the UAW, Teamsters and the like are today met with little, if any, public outrage. The difference seems to be that a strike by "public" employees is something unholy and completely deplorable. The irony is that objections to public employees' strikes are made by the very people who should understand — other union members.

If only these people would be able to see that when they criticize teachers' strikes, they put themselves in a management position — and sound like it. It's all relative, I guess.

The law that denies public employees the recourse to strike, afforded all other unions, is a bad one and needs to be wiped from the books. If it were, the result would be, I think, a greater concern among teachers to truly and at length debate the advisability of using such an ominous thing as a strike.

## Correction

On July 5, 1973, this newspaper published a column by Tim Richard discussing an "open meeting bill" introduced into the state legislature, which would prohibit all public bodies from having a secret meeting and which would carry misdemeanor penalties for violation. This column also made reference to Kenneth Perrin, former president of the Farmington school board, which held a series of private meetings some months ago in connection with the superintendent's termination.

A misreading of the statements made about Perrin in that column might indicate that we were accusing him of criminal behavior. We did not, and we are sorry if the statements in the column were construed by any reader in that way.

The point of the column was that firmer legal control over secret meetings by public bodies is needed, and that a good way to get it is to have legislation with teeth in it. We may disagree with Perrin over this public issue, but we have no intention of casting aspersions on his honesty or integrity.

## County Gives OK To Health Plan

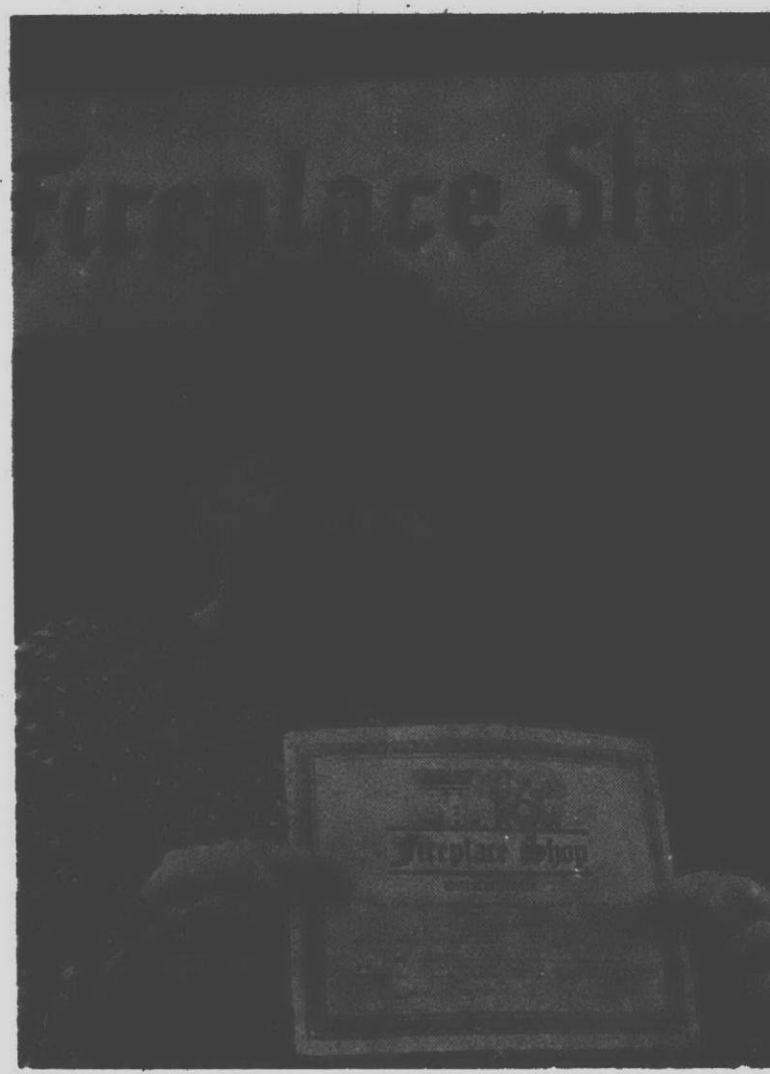
The Wayne County Board of Commissioners has approved a budget of nearly \$4 million for Project PRESCAD, a special program of health care for disadvantaged pre-school, school-age children and adolescents.

Approval of \$3,770,000 was granted by the commissioners at a meeting covering the fiscal year 1973-74, which ends June 30. That includes a \$396,375 expenditure to expand and improve PRESCAD services through Children's Hospital of Michigan. Also included is a \$166,745 agreement with the Southeastern Michigan Tuberculosis Detection Project.

The contract with Children's Hospital will pay for recruitment of physicians to work in PRESCAD clinics, provide them with staff privileges at the hospital, and reimburse the hospital for care of PRESCAD patients who have no health care insurance or other means of payment for health needs.

The Tuberculosis Detection Project will furnish statistical analysis and evaluation of services performed under the PRESCAD Maternal and Child Health Services program.

## TO THE GAS CUSTOMERS OF CONSUMERS POWER COMPANY NOTICE OF HEARING ON MOTION FOR PARTIAL AND IMMEDIATE GAS RATE RELIEF

On April 18, 1973, Consumers Power Company filed an application with the Michigan Public Service Commission with supporting testimony and exhibits in Case No. U-4331, which requests authority to amend its gas rates so as to increase its gas revenues by approximately \$50,400,000 on an annual basis and, at the same time, Consumers Power Company filed a Motion for Partial and Immediate Rate Relief which seeks authority, on an interim basis, to amend its gas rates so as to increase its gas revenues by approximately \$33,729,000 on an annual basis. On August 27, 1973, Consumers Power Company also filed a Motion for Partial and Immediate Rate Relief in its pending electric rate proceeding, Case No. U-4332. At the hearing hereinafter noticed, the motion for partial and immediate electric rate relief, Case No. U-4332, will be heard concurrently with the motion for partial and immediate gas rate relief, Case No. U-4331. In its motion, Consumers Power Company has stated that substantial increases in the cost of capital, gas, taxes, wages, equipment, materials and supplies have had a serious adverse impact upon the earnings level of its gas business and that it has not been able to attain the level of earnings in its gas business found to be reasonable in the prior gas rate order of the Michigan Public Service Commission.

The Michigan Public Service Commission has scheduled a hearing on the motions for partial and immediate rate relief filed in Case Nos. U-4331 and U-4332 and has ordered that notice be given that:

A. A public hearing on Consumers Power Company's motions for partial and immediate gas and electric rate relief will commence at 9:30 a.m. on October 8, 1973 in the offices of the Commission, Law Building, Lansing, Michigan 48913, and will continue, if necessary, on the succeeding days of the

week of October 8 at the same location and at such time as shall be determined by the presiding officer until the matter has been fully heard.

B. The parties who have already intervened in the above-entitled proceedings shall be entitled to participate as parties in the hearing on Consumers Power Company's motions for partial and immediate rate relief. Any additional persons or entities seeking to intervene for the purpose of participating in the hearing on the motions for partial and immediate rate relief shall file with the Commission, five (5) days prior to October 8, 1973, an original and eleven copies of the petition to intervene with proof of service upon Consumers Power Company and the other parties to this proceeding. A service list can be obtained from the Secretary of the Commission, Law Building, Lansing, Michigan 48913.

C. The interim rate increases described in this notice have been requested by Consumers Power Company. The Michigan Public Service Commission may either grant or deny the requested increases, or may grant lesser or greater increases than those requested.

Jurisdiction of the Commission in this matter is pursuant to Section 4 of Act 419, PA 1919, as amended (MCLA § 460.54); Sections 4, 6 and 6a of Act 3, PA 1939, as amended (MCLA §§ 460.4, 460.6, 460.6a); and the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 1954 Administrative Code, as amended, No. 54, R 460.11 et seq.

# 2 Die, At Least 14 Injured In Hayride Crash

— you could see all of their faces," Mrs. Bell said. "We thought maybe it was going to swerve around, but it was going too fast," she said.

When the trailer was struck, Mrs. Bell said, she saw her husband fly through the air. He landed on the opposite shoulder of the road where she cradled his head in her lap as his life ebbed.

According to the sheriff department, the accident occurred at 11:27 p.m. when the car driven by Thomas H. Anderson, 43, of 4953 Venoy, Westland, pulling the hay wagon was struck in the back by a car driven by Gary E. Wood, 25, of 33010 Akron, Westland.

The car pulling the wagon was backing up along North Territorial, deputies said, and Wood, westbound on Territorial, "could not stop in time."

The sheriff's report said there were 14 persons on the hay wagon — including the

two men who died. It also said Anderson was the only person in the car pulling the wagon and that Wood was alone in his car.

Witnesses told the sheriff the wagon, with no sides, had no tail lights. It did have reflectors on the back.

Following the crash, several of the injured wandered around the scene screaming and crying.

One injured woman was trapped beneath the cars. An attempt by several bystanders to roll the car over to free the girl proved unsuccessful.

She was finally freed by a Washtenaw County deputy who pulled her through a narrow gap between the cars.

Services for Bell and Leasure are being held today (Wednesday).

Bell's services were scheduled for 10 a.m. in the R.G. and G.R. Harris Funeral Home of Garden City. Burial was in Parkview Cemetery, Livonia.

Services for Leasure are

being held at 3 p.m. in Uht Funeral Home in Westland and will be followed by burial in Cadillac Memorial Gardens there.

Bell, an Air Force veteran, leaves his wife, Marie; two sons, Charles and Johnathan; and his mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Bell.

Leasure is survived by his wife, Joann (who is listed in serious condition in St. Jo-

seph Mercy Hospital following the accident); two children, Robert and Lois; father, James of Westland; two brothers, Calvin and Tony; and a sister, Mrs. Leora Smith of Wayne.

Leasure was a truck driver for a retail food company.

Among the more seriously injured were: Mrs. Leasure, 35; and Linda Grundy, 23, of 1056 Starkweather, Plymouth. Both were listed in serious condition at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor Monday.

Also injured were: Wood, listed in good condition at University hospital; Ken Graham, 23, of 36203

Plymouth Rd., Livonia, listed in fair condition at University, and his wife, Mary, 21, listed in good condition there; and Diane Kimmerling, 19, of 9295 Northern, Plymouth, in fair condition at University hospital.

Treated and released at University Hospital were: Anderson; Ivan Tessman, 28, and Susan Tessman, his wife, 27, both of Highland; Linda Anderson, 31, of 6850 New Providence Way, Plymouth; Lois Jeffries, 27, of Port Huron; William Caran, 19, of Highland; and Janet French, 17, of 9885 Beck Rd., Plymouth Township.

Treated and released from St. Joseph was Henry Kimmerling, 18, of 36203 Plymouth Rd., Livonia.

The outing had started at 6000 Napier Rd., the home of Fount (Junior) Jones, where the group of friends had gathered for a party. They had rented the trailer for the hay ride.

Some of those at the party had attended high school together, and many were related.

Among those who had remained at the party while the rest left on the hay ride was Jeff Grundy, whose wife was seriously injured.

He rushed to the scene where he found his wife lying

in the road being held by a woman bystander.

He also learned then that his cousin, Bell, had died.

Distraught he began shouting asking who was driving the car "that hit my wife."

As sheriff's deputies were arresting another man at the scene, Grundy apparently thought they were taking the driver of the other car into custody and he leaped over the trunk of one car toward the man.

Deputies restrained and then placed handcuffs on him to keep him quiet.

A sheriff's spokesman said the man they were arresting was Ralph Bezesky, 41, of Plymouth who was charged with being drunk and disorderly.

Deputies said he was not involved in the accident in any way but had refused to leave the scene when asked to do so by police.

In addition to the Washtenaw County Sheriff Dept., the Wayne County Sheriff Dept. and Michigan State Police responded.

Several private ambulances and those from the city and township of Plymouth also responded.

"What happened?" I asked her as I knelt beside her.

"We were pulling the hay wagon — it didn't have any lights on it," she said. "We were turning around and this guy came out of nowhere and hit us."

She was remarkably calm at the time — the only one who remained so following the crash.

A woman lay nearby her husband on the road; sometimes she was conscious, sometimes she fainted.

I was holding her trying to keep her alert — she looked badly hurt.

"Her name is Linda," said the woman holding her husband.

When we called her by her name, the injured woman came to, and we were able to keep her calm. My wife stayed with her.

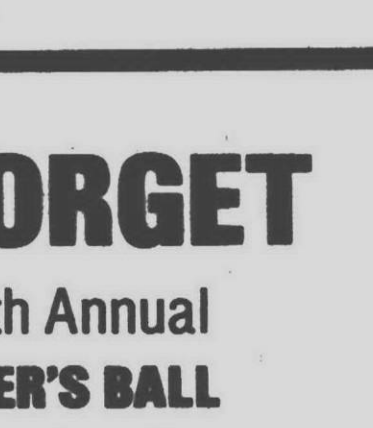
About that time we discovered someone lying in the ditch partly under the trailer and mostly covered with hay. He was dead.

From under the twisted cars, a girl was screaming.

Several of those who'd stopped to help tried to life one of the cars to get her out — we weren't able to do it.

When the sheriff got there, one deputy was able to pull her out from under the wrecks through a narrow gap in front of the front wheels of the car.

As the ambulances began to arrive, we were only in the way and walked back up the road.

But we weren't able to put the scene we'd just witnessed

out of our minds until long after the last police car and tow truck left at three in the morning.

We just kept wondering, "Could it have been avoided?"

"If there had been lights on the trailer, could it have been seen better?"

"Could the speed of the car hitting the trailer have been a factor? Could the other car and its trailer have turned in front of the oncoming car?"

"There were broken bottles of wine and beer scattered around. You could smell the booze. Had the people on the

hayride been drinking? Had their driver? Could that have been a factor?"

"If there had been an overhead light at the intersection, could it have illuminated the trailer and avoided the accident?"

Maybe these questions will be answered in the police and court investigations of the tragedy.

But the overall question remains:

Could the accident have been avoided? Could the lives of two people been spared?

You can see all those photos of accidents, but it doesn't really hit you until you're there at one like this.

In the safety of your office, you can crop the photos, write the cutlines and dummy them into the paper without ever getting the impact.

It's probably the same as when you see them in the paper. Think about that when you look at the pictures in today's paper.

Maybe you'll start driving a little more cautiously like I've noticed I have since Saturday.

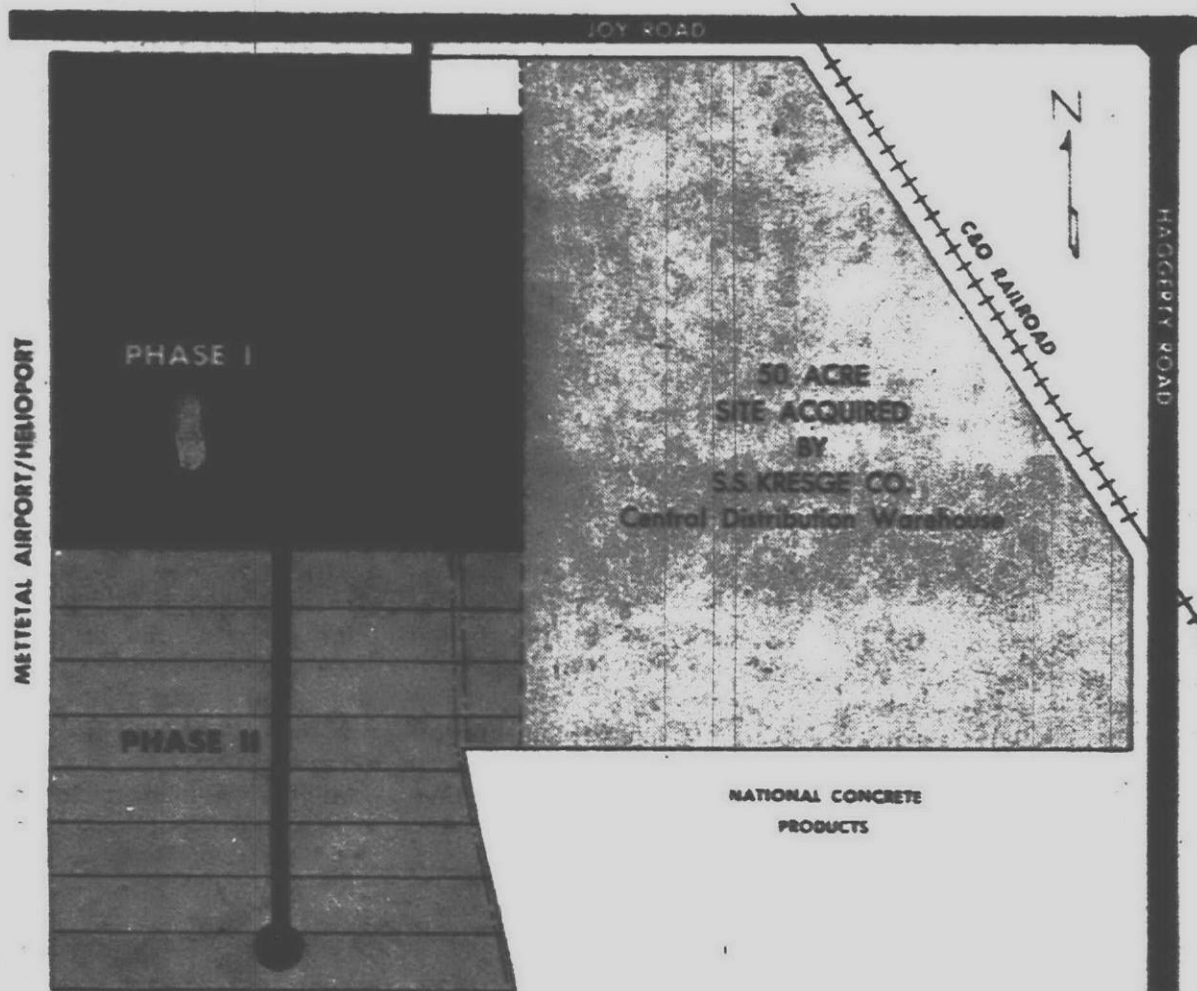

## Industrial Park Plans Unveiled For Canton

CANTON Plans for a 70-acre Canton Industrial Park on Joy Road west of Haggerty Road in Canton Township have been unveiled by the Chapper Organization and the Plymouth Area Economic Expansion Commission (PAEEC).

The original parcel for the park included the 50-acre site sold to S. S. Kresge Co. for its proposed central distribution warehouse at Joy and Haggerty Roads.

A spokesman for the Chapper group which has developed properties in Michigan

and Florida, George J. Athas, said tentative plans call for the park to be developed in two phases although it may be made in one phase if the sites sell well.

The Detroit-based developer hopes to capitalize on the location of the park being next to Mettetal Airport and is planning to lease or sell parcels and buildings.

Several parcels have already been contracted for, Athas said. Plans include a 60,000 square foot warehouse, a tennis club with indoor and

outdoor courts and a 10-acre heat treating plant.

The park will offer sanitary sewer, water and a class A road which will bisect the development.

Chapper is also contemplating a four-story office building for the site.

Construction is expected to begin soon on the park which is being sold - leased by Jarvis J. Schmidt & Co. of Detroit.

The site was procured and offered with the help of the PAEEC.

"I am a mother of four children," this protester shouted, "and if you think being a waitress is any fun, Brother, you've got another think coming."

"If your dining bill is too high, why don't you put the blame where it belongs - on the owner of the place?"

"Don't forget," she went

on, "those fellows get theirs first - and we get what's left. As the boss boosts the prices, the tips decrease. More than that, most of them pay starvation wages and by the time a waitress pays her income tax, there is little left."

"So you think leaving a six dollar tip for a dinner bill is outrageous," another voice of experience cut in, "well you should see the other side of the waitress job."

"How about the couple that comes in, all smiles," she asked, "and as you seat them you have visions of this being a nice, quiet dinner party with a sizable tip?"

# Society's Neglected

## Find Life With Dignity

(This is the first of two articles on Community Living Centers, Inc., which operates residences for retarded adults. The second will be published in Observing Life Wednesday, Oct. 3.)

For most people, it's no big deal to hold a job and be self-supporting.

Or to be accepted readily at home.

Or just to live in dignity. But for the retarded adult, finding any of these values in life has been nearly impossible — until recently.

The difference is Community Living Centers, a concept in group living that has blossomed in Farmington to give hope to the retarded and their families all over the country.

Four homes operated now by Community Living Centers, Inc., mean a new life for 51 retarded persons.

Two more are under construction and will accommodate 32 more. These are being built in Farmington and are the first to be funded by federal money through the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Mrs. Mary Wagner, executive director of Community Living Centers, has a waiting list that at last count numbered more than 200.

The 51 now in the program live in large, comfortable homes, each presided over by house-parents. Most have jobs and earn regular wages. Some spend their days in sheltered workshops, and a few go to school.

All do their share in home chores including taking care of their rooms.

Six young men even have advanced to the point where they have their own apartments, but they still are under the guidance of Community Living Centers.

Some of the current clients earn enough as dishwashers, hospital aides or maybe janitors to pay the \$240 a month room and board charge.

For others, there are full or supplemental stipends from the Michigan Department of Social Services. A few have families able to pay room and board for them.

All go regularly to the bank to take care of their own financial affairs — with the help of their house-parents and social workers in the Community Living operation.

And all find a pride in their homes and a comfortableness in their living situations that they never have known.

"There's a dignity these people never had before — in institutions and even in their own homes," said Mrs. Wagner.

"Before, they seldom went out and either just sat in institutions or were a problem to their families. Here they find closer relationships, have activities to enjoy."

One "boy" Mrs. Wagner loves to tell about, because he so well epitomizes the possibilities in this new way of looking at the retarded.

He was in an institution 17 years, she said, and barely learned to care for himself, let alone do any productive work. And the cost of his care there was anywhere from \$20 to \$40 a day.

"But we encourage them to be independent," she said. "Now not only paying his own way — he's saved money and buys savings bonds. He even likes to brag that now he's helping Uncle Sam, who took care of him for so long."

Community Living Centers have had several years of involvement, and most of its centers around Mary Wagner.

It was about five years ago that she began to realize, both as a special education teacher at North Farmington High School and as the mother of a retarded son, that there had to be something better for the retardate in today's society.

"Our special education students would seem to be doing well on the school programs," she said, "but after they graduated and were at home for a while they weren't doing so well."

"We had trained them for jobs, but without supervision they didn't function well in a work situation. And their families found them increasingly hard to handle."

She and her husband, Robert, a tool-and-die maker, took a couple of retarded boys into their home. With the supervision they knew how to give, the retardates did much better.

There were so many requests for more of this sort of care that in 1968 the Wagners and several other families formed a non-profit corporation to try to set up a community living situation.

Wagner House opened in October of 1969 with six young men at first. Ideally located in a rambling old farm house on 13 Mile in Farmington Hills that had been used as a nursing home and thus was zoned multi-dwelling, it is still going strong.

Robert Wagner is the official houseparent and he and his wife live there with their youngest son.

"The rules of Community Living Centers require that one of the houseparents not be otherwise employed," Mrs. Wagner said. "For us, I'm the working parent — my

husband quit his tool and die job and is kept very busy supervising the meals and home management and driving the residents to and from work."

Each of the four homes now operating has a van-type vehicle for transportation of the big "family."

The second center to open was a ranch home on the same 13 Mile property that had been built as a residence for nursing home employees. Mrs. Alice Edwards presides as house-parent there, and eight young men call it home.

Other homes have opened in Pontiac and Hazel Park, and in May of this year ground was broken for two more homes, just around the corner from the Farmington Nursing Home on Folsom Avenue.

These HUD-funded homes will provide space for 16 men and 16 women. The first in the country to be built for this specific purpose, they hopefully will serve as prototypes for more such homes.

The new homes, scheduled

to open in February, will be operated like the four already functioning through Community Living Centers.

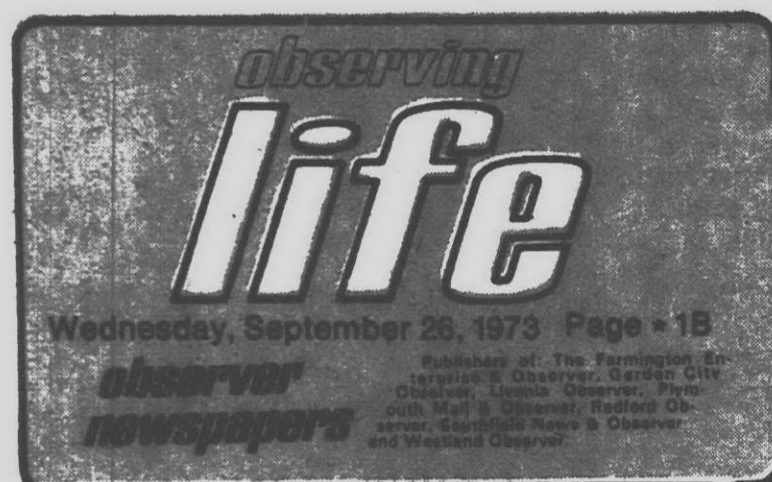
The organization, originally quartered in Wagner House, now has offices at 23280 Farmington Road in downtown Farmington. There Mrs. Wagner, social workers Jeanne Sadler, Vicki Nelson, and secretary Virginia Ditty keep complete records on all the residents.

"Success of our clients in this program has been due to our close follow-up methods," Mrs. Wagner said.

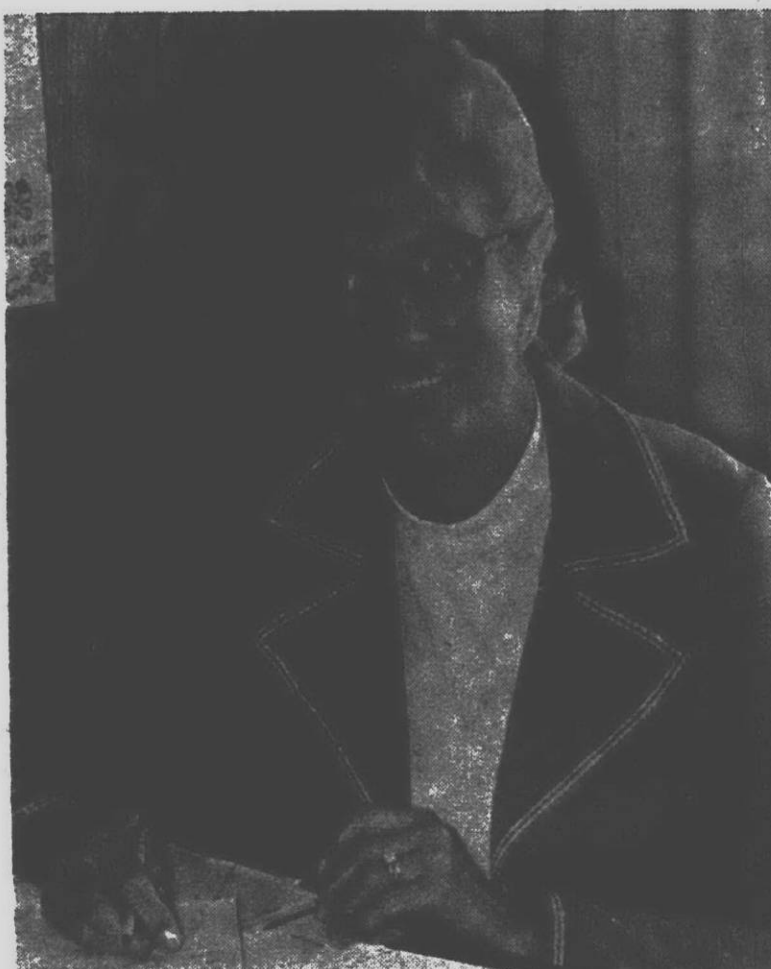
"Supervision is needed all the way, with close cooperation between residents, employers, social workers, houseparents, director and staff."

The social workers split the case load, but all functioning in that area are familiar with all the residents. They also work to some extent with those on the waiting lists to prepare them for community living.

# Canton Chiefs Score 1st Varsity Win, 27-13

It was a history-making 48 minutes of football for the Plymouth Canton Chiefs.

In only their second attempt to capture the spoils of victory without the support of a senior class, the first

year varsity broke into the win column.

Canton shook off its opening 25-0 loss to Grosse Ile to upend Dearborn Heights Annapolis, 27-13, and score its first varsity victory for the Plymouth school.

"We sure didn't look like the same team that got thumped by 25 points a week before," commented Canton Coach Jim Munelo. "The first half was an excellent effort with our mistakes giving them 13 points in the third quarter."

"It was a great afternoon of football," added Munelo who had watched Annapolis get dumped by Oak Park a week prior, 28-6.

Canton picked up an early sign of better things to come on the third play of the contest when Greg Burke recovered an Annapolis fumble on his own 49. Four plays later, Scott Dunagan broke loose for 49 yards up the middle. Mike Ogden made good the point after and the Chiefs were on the board, 7-0.

A three-yard quarterback sneak by Tom Close capped

a 68-yard drive for Canton on the last play of the opening quarter. Ogden converted, and the Chiefs led, 14-0.

Canton had rushed for 114 yards in that first quarter.

A 53-yard march was highlighted by Jeff Young's seven yard burst into the end zone in the second. Ogden made good another point after and Canton enjoyed a 21-0 half-time margin.

The third quarter brought back memories of the Grosse Ile setback with two fumbles deep in Canton's own territory

paving the way for two Dearborn scores.

Canton fumbled on its 27 to start the second half. Dane Podczewski then hit Bob Mack for a 19-yard TD play. The point after was good and it was 21-7.

The Chiefs again fumbled, this time on their own 12, and Dan Lamerado went over from one yard out. A two-point play missed but the difference was sliced to 21-13.

The final stanza saw Canton make use of a turnover with Burke hauling in a de-

flected Annapolis pass for the Chiefs. Dunagan finished a 43-yard drive with a one yard spurt. A run missed but Canton had a lead it knew it could sit on.

Canton collected 14 first downs to eight by Annapolis and totaled 286 yards rushing to only 29 by Dearborn. The passing game saw Canton hit on five of 15 for 83 yards and Annapolis eight of 19 for 74 yards.

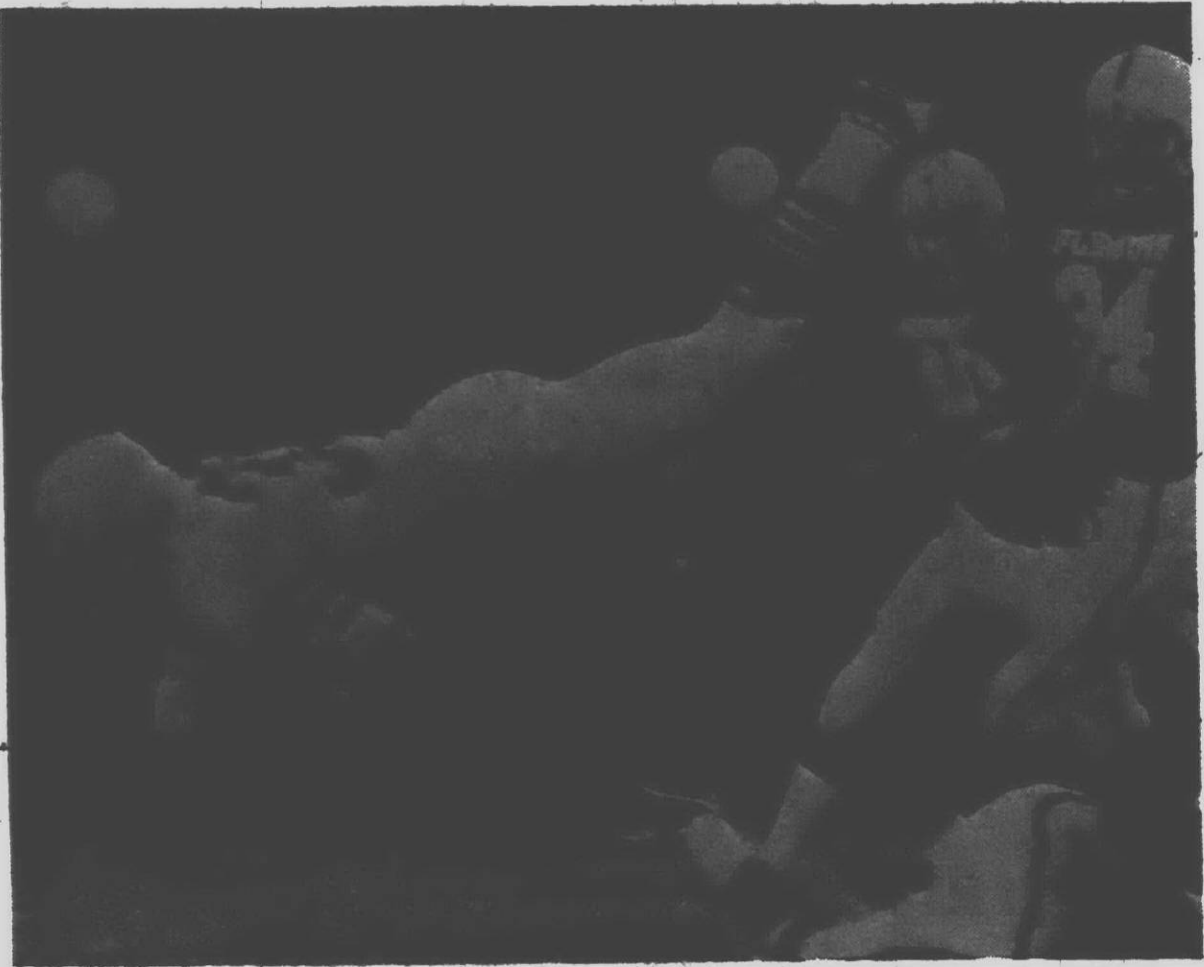
Canton's rushing attack was headed by Dunagan with 90 yards in 15 carries, Young with 84 yards in 15 carries

and Kim Hammonds with 75 yards in 10 attempts.

The Chiefs averaged 4.84 yards per carry, dominating the play with 79 offensive plays to only 45 by Dearborn.

Linebackers Mike Verduce and Harry Walker, along with tackle Jim Moore, sparked the Chiefs' defense which left much to be desired in the contest a week before.

## Edsel Ford Dumps Salem, 14-7

What Coach Tom Moshimer referred to as "the best defensive performance I've been here" kept Plymouth Salem's hopes for an upset of Dearborn Edsel Ford alive for more than 3 1/2 quarters, but it wasn't quite enough.

A 17-yard scoring burst by 200-pound Ralph Plummer with 3:44 left on the clock enabled Ford's Thunderbirds to begin defense of their Suburban Eight football crown with a 14-7 win over Rocks.

Now Plymouth's Rocks, 1-1 for the season, will invade Livonia Bentley for a 7:30 game Friday, seeking their fourth in a row over the Bulldogs in another Sub 8 contest.

Moshimer's mites - one of the smallest teams physically he has ever coached - won defensive plaudits as Doug Tripp and Jeff Waller both blocked Ford punts, Jim Mason and Gary Baker recovered fumbles, and the forward wall held for downs on the six and one yard lines.

But until they put together a 66-yard drive to the Ford eight, midway in the second half, the Rocks had little success in moving the ball offensively.

In fact, their net forward progress by both ground and air in the first half was only

six yards - a far cry from the 320-yard performance against Bloomfield Hills Andover a week earlier.

After a scoreless first half, the unbeaten Thunderbirds were first to crack the ice when Jim Bone picked up a bobbled Plymouth handoff and rammed 52 yards to the touchdown two minutes into the third quarter. Karl Ziomek kicked the first of his two extra points to make it 7-0.

Moments later Tripp's blocked punt gave Plymouth possession on the Ford 10, but the Rocks couldn't move. Then, after forcing Ford to punt, they put on their only big drive.

Paced by 10 and 17-yard sprints by Quarterback Rick Neu and a 25-yard gainer

by Tripp, Plymouth pushed to the Ford eight before the Thunderbirds stiffened and held for downs.

It was after five minutes of the final period that Waller blocked a Ford punt when the Thunderbirds had fourth and six on their own 15. The ball caromed into the end zone where Jerry Brink pounced on it for a touchdown. Jeff Horton's conversion created a 7-7 tie which lasted little more than three minutes.

The Thunderbirds immediately went to the air after the kickoff, gambling on their seven with a 49-yarder to Gary Schmidt. Two more passes to Kurt Anderson and Bone put Ford on Plymouth's 17 and Plummer made short work of it from there. Plymouth netted 56 yards

on the ground, led by Neu's 28 in 19 carries, and 30 in the air. Ford ended with 91 yards overland plus 105 on seven pass completions in 13 tries. Ford's Sub 8 foe this week will be Dearborn, already 0-2.

Persons who are motivated by ethical principles, without regard to religious denominations will be sought. ## Nature Centers Invite Students

Teachers in schools located in Wayne, Macomb, Oakland, Livingston and Washtenaw counties now have an opportunity to stimulate their students' interest in studies which relate to the environment by arranging a scheduled class visit to one of three nature centers of the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority.

The HCMA nature centers include Stony Creek Metropark near Utica, Kensington Metropark near Milford and Lower Huron Metropark near Belleville, with information and appointments available by phoning HCMA headquarters at 600 Woodward Ave., Detroit.

A nature center appointment gives the class and teacher exclusive use of the exhibit room for a 45-minute session, including a short talk by a park naturalist who uses the exhibits and other natural objects to explain some of the interesting ecological relationships of the area.

When appointments are scheduled, teachers may suggest a lecture topic which is suited to the current classroom studies. "The Preparation of Plants and Animals For Winter" has often been a popular topic.

The nature centers at Stony Creek and Kensington Metroparks offer appointments starting daily at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, available both in the fall and winter.

At Lower Huron Metropark the nature center appointments start at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, available in the fall only.

No appointments are required for trail use, which are available daily 8 a.m. to dusk. Rules prohibit the collection of leaves and other objects in the park.

Classes usually bring their own lunch, which can be enjoyed at nearby picnic areas since there are no indoor lunchroom facilities.

## Court To Evaluate Plan For Closing Children's Center

Expert testimony will be taken in October in a court suit which challenges a new plan for care of retarded and emotionally - troubled children in Wayne County. The hearings will be before Circuit Judge Thomas Roumell.

The civil suit charges that the new plan might not provide quality care. The class action suit was filed on behalf of Local 832 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, and three children at the Wayne County Child Development Center and their parents.

Roumell's order that both sides' present expert witnesses be issued at a show cause hearing.

Defendants in the case are the County Board of Commissioners, the State of Michigan, Gov. Milliken and Dr. E. Gordon Yudashkin, director of the State Department of Mental Health.

The new plan calls for creation of a central referral agency to place retarded and troubled children in community-based facilities, with the Child Development Center eventually being closed.

The plan was adopted by the commissioners in May upon recommendation of a joint state-county task force appointed by the governor at the request of County Board Chairman Robert E. Fitzpatrick.

# Plymouth Symphony Undergoes Changes

Some major changes are in store for Plymouth Symphony fans during the 1973-74 season. Conductor Wayne Dunlap will continue his programming of familiar classics with

a measured offering of the unfamiliar and new works, all aimed at expanding the horizons of the audience and keeping the orchestra on its toes.

Dr. Richard Kirchgatter, the young veterinarian who is president of the symphony society, announced several innovations for Observ-erland's oldest orchestra:

• Opening program will be on a Thursday (Oct. 11) at 8 p.m., although other con-certs will be on the tradition-al Sunday afternoons at 4.

• The orchestra will go on tour. The Oct. 11 program will be repeated Oct. 14 at Grand Valley State Colleges, Allendale, where Dunlap is

head of the music depart-ment. Soloist will be pianist Richard Syracuse, whose Ro-mantic bravura was demon-strated in last year's opening program with the Liszt first concerto. This time he will perform Beethoven's fourth concerto.

• K-12 students will be ad-mitted free at four of the six concerts. The only exceptions will be the Christmas sea-son offering of Handel's "The Messiah" with the Kenneth Jewell Chorale and the Sev-ero Ballet performance of "Giselle" in March. Students below sixth grade must be accompanied by a parent.

• Senior citizens residing in Tonquish Creek Manor will

be picked up by a bus and given free transportation to the concerts, beginning about 45 minutes before concert time. All concerts will be in Plymouth's Salem High School, Joy Road west of Canton Center Road.

• Except for the Oct. 11 concert, babysitting services by qualified girl scouts will be available.

• Tickets will be available at the door for the four

"regular" concerts - Oct. 11, Nov. 18, Jan. 27, and April 21. For the Dec. 9 "Messiah" and March 10 "Giselle," it is advisable for non-members of the Plymouth Symphony Society to purchase tickets in advance at either Heide's Flowers or Melody House in downtown Plymouth.

• This year's membership drive is being conducted in fall, a little closer to the concert season, rather than in

May, as has been the custom. Dr. Kirchgatter said a major effort is being made to expand membership in order to keep pace with the ex-panding population as well as to cover increasing costs.

## Environment Respected In New Communities

Most new communities are built around a "theme." It may be leisure living. Or on-site recreation. Or the nostalgia of a rustic year-year.

But, whatever the specifics, the general appeal is based — not only on good quality homes — but on a better quality of life.

One new community, for instance, is combining the best of the past (authentic Early American archi-

ture), the present (up-to-date conveniences) and the future (prize-winning environmental safeguards). It's Wood Creek Courts, a 20-acre complex 30 miles north of Chicago.

The community is planned as eight clusters of seven to 11 homes each. Every cluster will have a particular motif, such as Bucks County, Tidewater Virginia, Natchez and Nantucket, to which homes within it will scrupulously adhere.

cerns, World Creek Courts won an environmental honor award. More than 40 per cent of the wooded site will be left in its natural state. In the building areas, 1,800 trees — some 30 feet tall — were carefully pruned to reduce shock.

Before road and utility sites were selected, test drilling was conducted to locate and protect tree root systems.

Some of the house designs date back to 1690. But, most of the authentic detail was imaginatively duplicated with modern ponderosa pine woodwork available in stock sizes and a variety of styles at local lumber dealers.

In the Bucks County enclave, for example, homes feature split fieldstone facades, narrow siding and angular roofs.

Entrances are colonial cross-and-bible wood panel doors with decorative sidelights and pediments. Shutters are authentically-styled raised wood panels or louvers.

Wood stairways, mantels and moldings — though stock items — have the handsome detailing found in original Early American handcraft.

Window selection shows how old world design was merged with modern technology.

Traditional double-hungs and "boxed" casements have handy removable grilles which give an elegant small-pane appearance, yet lift right off the glass for easy window cleaning.

The windows are wood sash units with insulating glass, which eliminates the need for storm sash, substantially cuts heat loss and assures year-round comfort. Their insulating qualities also help conserve energy — an important consideration in this ecology-minded community.

## Ryegrass Under Trees

Growing grass under trees is usually more difficult than having a good turf in the open.

Certain varieties are rather tolerant of shade, dryness, and the infertile soil typical of shaded habitat - fescues such as Highlight, Jamestown and Ruby, for example. But whatever the grass, higher than normal mowing under trees gives the grass an advantage.

New evidence suggest that more is involved when trying to hold lawngrass under trees than just reduced light and competition for nutrients and water. At least in some cases the tree roots secrete substances that retard the grass.

In a Florida study roots of silver maple were especially restrictive to bluegrass rooting (even though all the light, moisture, and fertility the grass could use was provided).

Where it is impossible to

hold topflight turf under trees, an overseeding each autumn (as the tree leaves are shed) makes sense.

Fast-sprouting perennial ryegrasses scratched into thin sod can provide winter cover even though the stand may thin out again next summer.

The new varieties such as Compas, Manhattan, NK-100, NK-200, Pelo and Pennfine, are bringing acclaim to this often-overlooked species.

Five century-old private homes in Northville will be open to the public Thursday, Sept. 27, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

ed the day of the tour at the First Presbyterian Church, 200 E. Main. A bake sale will be held there and a luncheon will be held in St. Paul Lutheran Church from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Homes to be toured include those of James Harris, David Sicary, Harvey Smith, Richard Bohns and Robert Coates.

The Harris home on Main Street was built and lived in by the Dubuar family around 1880. The Queen Anne style house retains original plank

floors, woodwork, frosted and cut ruby red windows and an old cellar.

The Sicary home is a restored Italian style decorated in a mixture of old and new. The original attic on the third floor has been redecorated and will be open.

The Smith home, once used as a dentist office, was built in 1855. It is an American classic home and changes have been made in the interior, including addition of antiques. It also has an Indian room which contains several

artifacts, some collected and some crafted by the children.

The Bohns home is approximately 90 years old and is furnished with treasures from Greece and England. The basement family room is decorated as an English pub with a Tudor effect.

## The Green Thumb

One of the worst pests of the home garden is the white fly.

Anyone who grows house plants can tell you that white flies can be a real problem on them as well. To date, pesticides haven't been too helpful, but now there is a biological control that really works on white fly, the pest that breeds so profusely it looks like snow. Some even call it "flying dandruff".

In Canada the multi-million dollar greenhouse industry is provided with tiny parasitic wasps which are just plain murder on the white flies.

The embryo parasites develop on tobacco leaves which are distributed to growers who hang the leaves in their greenhouses after white flies have been noticed.

One grower who has two acres under glass and one acre of plastic greenhouses raises two crops of tomatoes annually writes: "I began using the parasites to control the white fly last year. I never had to spray. I avoided residues and the control worked out well."

Another grower who specializes in succulent, European seedless cucumbers (also attacked by the white fly) says, "I don't have a white fly problem. I found last year that biological control is successful, providing you begin at the right time."

The control insect is *Encarsia formosa*, a tiny wasp which is the natural enemy of white flies. Biological control is not new. It was known

to Europeans and Canadian researchers some 40 years ago.

White flies are not just a nuisance pest, they can make greenhouse and house plants completely unsalable and unsightly. The white flies literally suck sap from plants and excrete a sticky, sugary substance called "honeydew."

There's nothing sweet about honeydew and the deposit leads to the development of a black, sooty fungus which effectively ruins the sight of plants.

The *Encarsia formosa* is a creature about 1/40th inch in length and it's almost too good to be true. It's a harmless parasite which doesn't bite humans and doesn't harm plant tissue. It is very specific against white fly upon which it depends completely.

Dr. Robert McLanahan is the chief architect in developing biological control in Canada, and is not working with leaf miner parasites. Let's have more work done on developing biological control methods.

**GREEN THUMB CLINIC:** "Is there a good method for freezing tomatoes?"

Ans: Try this one which we like: Just remove the stem from ripe and perfect tomatoes, wash and place into plastic bags. Place into the freezer. To use, simply hold under hot water faucet and skin slips off readily. They can be used in almost any way except for slicing.

# Evergreens Vary In Height, Color, Texture

Have you ever heard of a blue rug or a mint julep juniper, or a Hoopoe blue spruce or a table top pine?

These are but a few of the many attractive new varieties of evergreens that are available at local nurseries and garden centers.

In recent years a great many new kinds of evergreens have been propagated so it is no longer necessary to restrict your landscaping to the same old spreading yews and pfitzer junipers.

There are evergreens available in all sizes from flat kinds that creep along the ground to tall spires and giant trees.

There are kinds that grow into low mounds, or broad vase shapes, or large pyra-

mids, or tall slender columns.

Colors and textures vary. There are pale silvery greens, and blue-greens, and yellow-greens, and kinds with golden tips on deep green branches. There are evergreens with bristly bottle-brush needles, with soft fern-like foliage, with needles like overlapping scales.

It pays to make a trip to some local nurseries and garden centers before deciding what to plant. Look around at what is available.

The larger specimens are generally "balled" and "buried" to protect the roots and minimize the shock to transplanting. Many of the smaller specimens are in cans or plastic containers in which they have been growing for a year or two.

Discuss with the nurseryman the characteristics of the various plants that look appealing to you. Find out how big each variety will ultimately grow—how wide a spread, how tall. Also find out if it is a fast growing kind or a slow grower.

Some plants may eventually get very large, but may take a long time to reach mature size. Others seem to grow by leaps and bounds and reach a large size in a few years. Rate of growth may play a part in your decision as to whether to use a plant.

After you have found out what is available, you can give some thought to a landscape plan. Decide what will do the most for your home.

Your front entrance should

look inviting at all seasons. This is why evergreens are a popular choice. They can stand up to close scrutiny any time of year.

Plan so you accent and highlight the front door, and enhance the architectural lines of the house. Don't block windows, though, or hide too much of the house.

There is no need to make your house look like it is squatting in a nest of greenery. Use plants in groups and let the ground-line show in some places.

Don't use too many kinds of plants or your landscaping will look cluttered or spotty. On the other hand, if there is no variety at all, the planting will be monotonous.

Two or three kinds of plants generally provide all the variety that is needed.

Don't forget that they don't all have to be evergreens. Some leaf-losing shrubs or

small trees can be used to great advantage.

A small flowering tree such as a dogwood or crab or a large shrub such as a purple leaf plum or burning bush can create a striking focal point. Low spreading evergreens surrounding it combine to form a very attractive grouping.

If your plan calls for a mat-like evergreen ground covering, look for one of the varieties of creeping juniper. Sargent juniper and Waukegan juniper have a steel-blue color. Creeping juniper and Japanese juniper are blue-green. These all remain less than a foot in height.

Tamarix juniper which has a gray-green color and fine texture, and Andorra juniper which has a light green color that turns purple-brown in winter, are under two feet in height.

Medium sized junipers in-

clude Savin juniper, dwarf pfitzer, Armstrong juniper and many others. Gold thread is a striking variety with narrow, drooping branch tips colored bright yellow.

Such unusual varieties that call immediate attention to themselves must be used with great care and restraint. Even though they are attractive they may not blend well with the rest of the landscaping.

Tall junipers include red cedar and silver cedar, which are really not cedars at all.

There are a few varieties of Japanese yews that are under a foot in height, but these are quite rare. The varieties duressens and minima are among the smallest. Densa can reach four feet in height with a spread of eight feet.

There are many other yews in this medium range, including Wards and Browns, both popular varieties that can be kept with a rounded form.

Hicks is tall and narrow, and the popular large upright, cone-shaped yew is known botanically as Taxus cuspidata capitata, or "cap" for short.

Pines, hemlocks, spruce, cypress and arborvitae are other evergreens. Some have dwarf forms suitable for use near the house. Many grow into tall trees.

Be sure you know what you are buying and planting—and you will be spared some surprises in years to come that might not be altogether pleasant ones.

Know what you need and what you are getting—and you will get the most value for your landscape dollars.

## Save Cherry Tomatoes From Frost

A quick way to save those late cherry tomatoes that might otherwise die in the first frost is to pull the whole plant out, shake to remove any rotten fruits, and hang in the garage until the fruit ripens, says J. Lee Taylor, Michigan State University horticulturist.

## DNB Offers Trees For Reforestation

The Department of Natural Resources is making more than four million young pine and spruce trees available at cost for fall reforestation projects, such as growing timber crops or soil erosion control.

DNR foresters say anyone owning enough acreage to support such a project can qualify to buy the trees at cost. The trees will not be sold for use in ornamental landscaping, however.

"We were in the vicinity of Banff and Lake Louise in the Canadian Rockies one afternoon when these two women started quarreling. As one of the guides, I had to get them apart. To do so, I gave up my room to one of them and moved in with a fellow named Robert Carey."

"That started our long time friendship, and Bob is now president of the Thompson-Brown Co."

"After that episode at Lake Louise," Bill went on "I went back to school as assistant director of admissions."

It was there that he crossed paths with Carey again, and the friendship was forged that has led to one of the largest real estate operations in the state.

"Bob got a call from Detroit," Bowman related, "and came over here to work for Charlie Brown in the real estate business. It wasn't long after until he invited me over, too, and we've been together ever since."

A great many things have happened since those days in 1964.

At that time, they began developing Normandy Hills on the south side of 11 Mile Road, west of Farmington Road.

"During those early days," Bowman recalled, "I used to place a big sign on the top of my car and go around selling real estate lots for the company that was dominated by three families - Henry Thompson, Charlie Brown and C.J. Fleming."

From this start the pair - Bowman and Carey - gradually bought into the firm, and with keen business sense and hard work they have taken over the company that last year did an overall gross business of \$40 million.

Under their guidance, the firm branched out from just selling real estate to developing communities and industrial parks.

In this capacity, the company is credited with the development of Farmington Hills and the large Farmington Freeway Industrial Park that was the first to receive an "A" rating from the State of Michigan.

Aside from the industrial park, the company developed several subdivisions in the process of changing the landscape.

All the while, Bowman and the company have followed the philosophy, "By doing well for others you can do well for yourself."

"We try to give the people - residents and industrialists - what they want," he said, "and it has worked out well."

When it was pointed out that there seemed to be a

gap in that philosophy in that the company has built the industrial plants and surrounded them with homes in the \$60,000 to \$100,000 range and nothing for the men who work in the shops, Bowman countered:

"In our surveys, we found that the 'decision makers' - management and research engineers - want to live close to the plant. As a matter of fact, a huge percentage of the supervisory manpower wanted it. On the other hand, the worker in the plant wants to get away a bit and drive to work or commute from Detroit."

As he peered out over the landscape along I-696, the young realtor, who is built like a college football player, prophesied that the day may not be too far away when the residential development would stretch to Brighton

and become one large complex.

Wouldn't the present economy and the high price of mortgage money slow down such development?

"Real estate is just like

milk," he answered. "The demand is always there. When milk prices went up, people didn't stop drinking milk."

"Likewise, there'll always be a demand for homes. And when you get right down to it, where can you find a better investment than purchasing a home?"

"We have found that the average family remains in one place only about five years, and the homes usually are sold for a profit."

While he didn't mention it, the gleam in his eye told you that he was visioning industry and commercial and office districts all along the line to Brighton.

"The new highways are going to bring us closer," he said, "and therefore there always will be a demand."

It was this optimism and

progressive thinking that earned Bowman his latest honor - being named realtor of the year by the Northwest Association.

In choosing him, the Real Estate Board said it considered the enormous amount of work he has put into a variety of projects including work with the Society of Industrial Realtors, the Michigan Real Estate Securities, and Syndication Chapter and the new Michigan Land Sales Act, along with the responsibility of being president of the board.

Since joining the firm in 1964 Bowman has progressed steadily up the ladder. He became co-manager of the building division in 1968, was elected a director in 1969 and named vice president in 1971. From there he moved into the executive vice presidency in 1975.

In his college days he earned his BA Degree at William Jewell College in 1962 and prior to that served in the U.S. Marines from 1945 to 1947.

He personally played a major role in Farmington's entry into industrial and commercial parks activities, the first of which was developed in 1970. Three additional Class "A" parks have since been developed by the firm.

With all this activity, he also holds membership in almost every real estate group that is available.

He became an active member of the Michigan Chapter of the Society of Industrial Realtors in 1969 and was appointed to its industrial development committee in 1971 and currently serves as president of the group.

Licensed as a builder in the State of Michigan, he is a

member of the Builders Assn. of Southeastern Michigan, the Michigan Home Builders Assn. and the National Assn. of Home Builders.

He is a member of the exclusive Young Turks National Builder/Developer organization and has been listed in "Who's Who" since 1964.

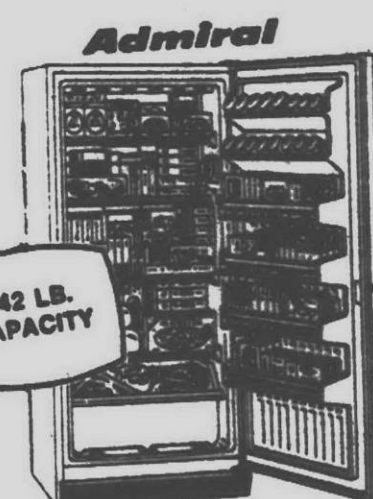

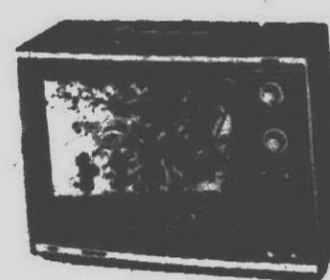

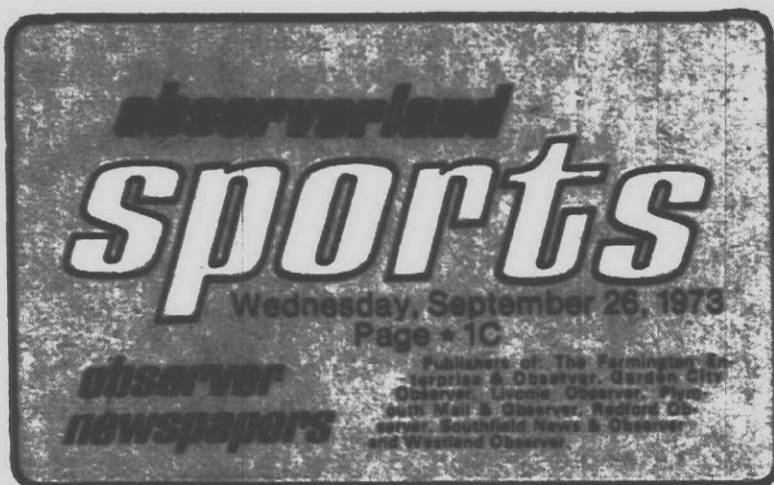

# Thurston QB Sparkles In 31-0 Victory



An overtime defeat in prep football is hard for any coach to swallow, and for first year Thurston High Coach Don Reel that task had to be twice as tough in the overtime opening loss to Churchill.

"It was really tough to lose it that way," commented Reel, whose squad picked itself up for game No. 2 and crushed Romulus, 31-0. "We decided to play a complete football game."

The "complete" game could well have been labeled Gary D'Ascenzo day as the Eagle quarterback accounted for the 31 points in tossing four touchdown passes, converting four extra points and booting a 37-yard field goal.

"You couldn't say enough about Gary's performance," said Reel, who also commented that his squad sliced the penalty yardage from 100 yards against Churchill to only 40 against Romulus.

The Eagles, who open their Northwest League campaign Saturday with Oak Park at home at 2 p.m., scored the first time they had the ball.

Thurston linebacker Dave Smith pounced on a Romulus fumble on their 30 and six plays later. D'Ascenzo tossed a 10-yard scoring pass to Ray Ivey. The quarterback converted and it was 7-0.

The next time Thurston gained control, it took them

only three plays to score with D'Ascenzo combining with John Roy for a 35-yard six-point play. The kick was good and it stood 14-0 after one quarter.

Thurston's second quarter scoring drive started on its own 25 with a D'Ascenzo to Tom Dowdy 23-yard swing pass capping a march with D'Ascenzo splitting the up-rights at 21-0.

The second half saw Reel change his game plan.

"I gave Gary the team," commented Reel, who usually calls the plays from the sidelines.

On a third down and from his own 17, D'Ascenzo hit Dowdy on a screen pass and the Eagle receiver broke a tackle and spurred 83 yards to another six points and a 28-0 margin.

A 37-yard field goal by Thurston's "Mr. Everything" climaxed the Eagle assault, D'Ascenzo finishing with all 31 points to his credit.

Thurston mustered nine first downs to four by Romulus and outrushed them, 143 to 40. The Eagle aerial game netted 186 yards with D'Ascenzo hitting on five of seven. Two for five and 19 yards was the air story for Romulus.

## Churchill Wins, 26-0

Eleven straight and going strong has to be the cry of Churchill High's gridiron squad.

The '73 unit has picked up right where the '72 squad left off. Churchill was 9-0 in '72 and allowed just 20 points.

Churchill won its season opener over Thurston in overtime, 14-7 and blanked Westland John Glenn, 26-0.

The Chargers first test in defending their Western Six crown will come this Friday night against Walled Lake Western with the contest being played at Walled Lake Central High at 8 p.m.

The shutout over Glenn was a complete defensive effort with Churchill allowing Glenn just eight yards rushing and 12 in the air.

It was Glenn's second blanking of the season. First year Coach Lloyd Carr has to be wondering what it must feel like to write down a score on his statistics board.

Churchill rushed for 178 yards and passed for 17 on two of seven passes with Matt Foster grinding out 91 yards in 23 carries, and scoring one touchdown on a one yard plunge.

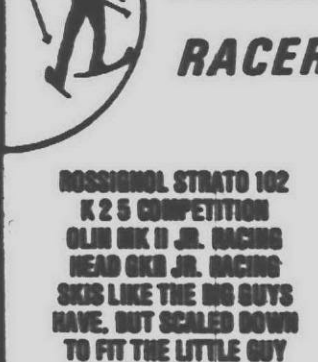

ago and has been president and general manager ever since.

Jackson celebrated its silver anniversary Saturday and Slavin was honored by city officials Sunday for his 25 years developing and making the half-mile plant one of the finest in the mid-west.

It wasn't an easy task. Slavin took over from a promoter who tried to make the venture a success but found it took a lot more money than he had.

Slavin became interested and even though a wealthy individual, it appeared he, too, would run out of the coin of the realm. The genial Slavin took his losses with a smile and dropped almost a half million before he finally got the raceway to a point where he was actually breaking even. That is, if he just forgot some of the expenses and marked them down to experience.

Jackson started operation under Slavin, almost four years after Northville Downs had pioneered pari-mutuel wagering on night harness racing in Michigan.

Determined to make the track a success, since he had never known defeat in his years of business in the card-board and paper business in Kalamazoo where he owned

a couple of plants, Slavin started a promotion campaign aimed to make the name of Jackson Raceway known throughout the state.

His initial goal was to develop and bring out new bettors from outstate to finance the operation. It took several years before he achieved that goal, years when the losses were tremendous and it appeared the end would never be in sight.

That's why it was so nice to learn of the silver anniversary celebration and the dinner in his honor. However, we'd like to make book right now that he's busy with the Jackson Raceway meeting but most of his thoughts are focused on the coming Jackson - at - Northville season starting in mid-November.

We think he is busy working on ideas to promote that meeting and make it even more successful than last year when he staged a \$30,000 series of pacing stakes, winding up with a \$10,000 championship.

It will be interesting to see what he comes up with this year. You can bet it will be something new and interesting.

Again our congratulations to a real gentleman who has done an excellent job of promoting and building harness racing interest outstate.

Are weddings throughout the world the same as those in the United States?

And, indeed, do weddings in the United States have the same general characteristics?

In her book, "The Eternal Bliss Machine: America's Way of Wedding," author Marcia Seligson attempts to chronicle the customs, rites and traditions surrounding the ceremony of marriage in the United States.

Claiming to have "attended 45,000 weddings (or so it seems)" throughout the country in a two year period (that would come down to a mere 61 per day), Ms. Seligson draws the following conclusions:

1) The American Way of Wedding is a glaring reflection of the American way of life. Primarily, it is a metaphor for our two paramount lifelong concerns as people -- Love and Money.

2) Americans are getting married almost precisely as they used to a hundred years ago.

3) The wedding is the most important day in life to an American girl. "She is, today, the fairy princess, queen for a day, Eliza Doolittle at the ball... For a man, marriage is but a continuation of growth and change; for her it is the REAL beginning."

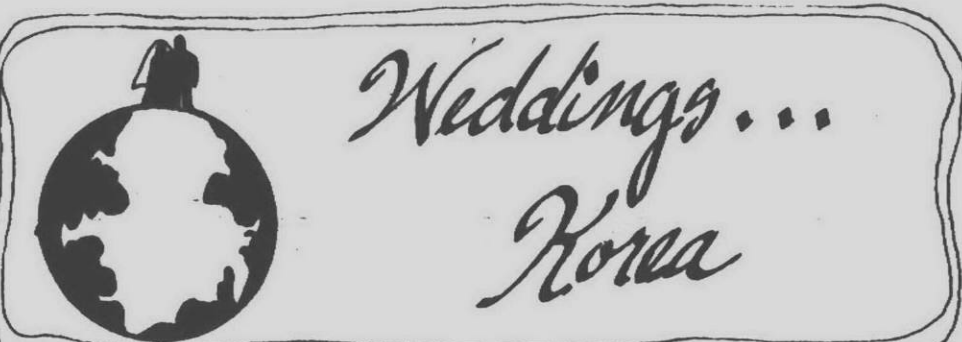
4) To the bride's family, those who actually create the wedding, it becomes a symbol of the fulfillment of their roles as parents.

5) The so-called "New Wedding" involves only a small fraction of today's couples, but will distinctly influence the future. (Ms. Seligson foresees having to reserve cow pastures six months in advance.)

6) There is no such animal as "The Typical American Wedding."

In Korea, there is a vast discrepancy between the old and the new -- which shows up well when trying to discover Korean wedding customs.

Dr. Young Mo Lee and his wife Sang Yeon Kim, residents of Livonia, were married in their native South Korea 12 years ago. They had what they term "a western-style wedding" modeled after those in the western countries and popular in the large cities of Korea.

"I wore a long white dress in a Presbyterian church," Mrs. Lee related. "For the reception, I changed into a Korean dress... but many do not. It was very much what you do here."

"There was no large wedding cake," Mrs. Lee said, "but many small ones. When guests bring gifts to the church, they are given individual cakes in thanks."

CONFETTI WAS THROWN at the bride and groom, rather than the rice which marks many a wedding in the United States. "When we were married, the government was trying to cut down any extravagance, attempting to simplify our lives," Dr. Lee reported. "Throwing rice -- our main food -- would have been considered a waste."

The Lees took a honeymoon, rid-

ing a special "honeymooners' train" which was headed for Korea's resort area. Upon their return, a party was held at the bride's house; later, another was given at the groom's house.

"It is the custom for the bride and groom to live at the groom's home -- for at least a short period -- so that the bride may learn the 'ways of his house'," Mrs. Lee said. Many Ko-

their guests, they said, "Oh, it's the greatest conversation piece you can imagine."

"We just tell everyone how eccentric our decorator is!"

BEFORE NEWLYWEDS DECORATE they ought to give some thought that a home should reflect the couple who live in it. It seems to me that if love, care, mutual respect and tolerance, and a sense of sharing and partnership are the elements of a good marriage, they will manifest themselves in the home.

Indeed, some places radiate such warmth that from the moment you walk in you feel comfortable. The tension generated by power struggles, one-upmanship, and other domestic games is absent; in its place is a kick-off-your-shoes openness.

The most important indicator of a happy home, from a decorator's viewpoint, is an aura of sharing. And by sharing I mean 50-50, not 90-10.

great chair and strong reading light, large ashtray, and a hassock on which to put his feet in the living room; he will make sure she has a corner for her easel or loom, or that her taste in art is well represented on the walls.

THE SMALL APARTMENT should give off a feeling that its occupants enjoy being together even while they're doing their own things.

If it's a large apartment or a house, with two people of strong and varied interests, each may have one or more rooms to himself or herself.

Some of your compromises may spoil the decorating effect, but if compromise is the name of the game in marriage, why not institute it in the most important place in your life -- your home?

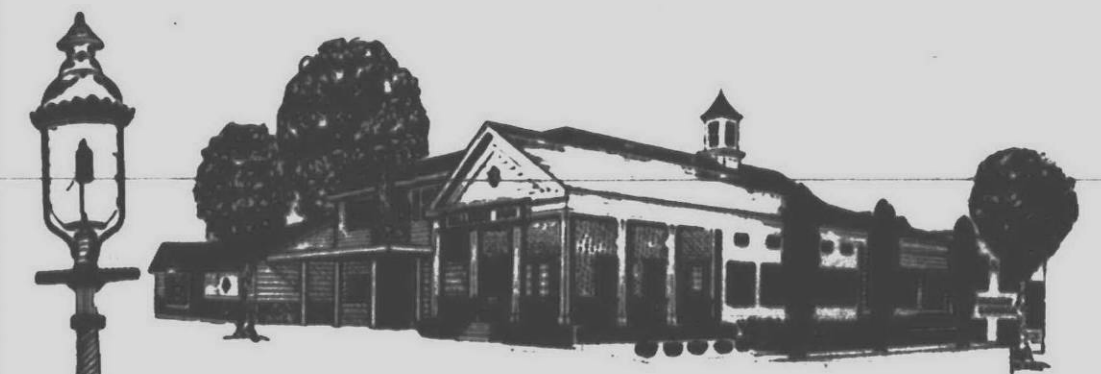

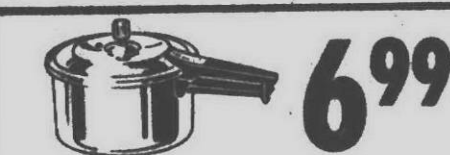

rean couples live their whole lives with the groom's family, although this is changing.

**THE ROOTS OF THIS CUSTOM** come from 4,000 years of Korean history, according to Dr. Lee. In the countryside, weddings follow the practices outlined by Confucius and prescribed during the 500 year Lee Dynasty until the Japanese occupied Korea.

"In the old days," Dr. Lee said, "boys and girls were kept separated after the age of seven. By the time they were of marriageable age, there was the need of a matchmaker.

"And to this day, in the rural areas of Korea, each family retains the services of a matchmaker. It is usually a woman -- the soul of honesty -- who will inform the groom's family the true background of the bride and vice versa.

"The prospective bride and groom have no say in the matter," Mrs. Lee interjected. "The agreement is between the fathers."

One of the deciding factors in a suitable marriage is whether the couple's birth dates -- called "the four posts" -- the month, day, year and time of day match up well. This is determined by a fortune teller, Dr. Lee explained. "I don't really believe they know what they are doing, but is an astrology type of thing."

"If all goes well, the father of the groom sends a formal letter to the bride's family. The bride's father must also accept by letter.

"On a day previous to the wedding, the groom's best friend takes a gift box to the home of the bride. In it are contained "the four posts" of the bride and groom set down in writing; also two bolts of material -- one red and one blue."

According to the custom, which is also practiced by modern Koreans -- including the Lees -- the bride's father receives the package and without looking must open it up and select one of the bolts of cloth. If he chooses the blue one -- the couple will have a boy first. If the red -- a girl.

The groom's friend is given some money for his trouble. He returns to the groom's house and they use the

money for a night of celebration.

**"THE MORNING OF THE WEDDING**, the groom comes on horseback to the bride's home," Mrs. Lee continued the story. "A carriage follows -- to carry the bride and her possessions to the home of the groom. Her parents follow.

"Generally, a woman performs the ceremony -- an older person who has had a good life," Mrs. Lee said. "But the ceremony mainly is between the parents. The bride keeps her head down in a shy manner. Very likely she has never seen the groom before this day.

"She wears a costume mainly composed of red and yellow. Those colors indicate 'newly wed'."

The old-style Korean bride has no veil, but wears a special ornament in her hair made of stones and designed to look like a flower. "She may not wear this ornament again until her 60th birthday," Mrs. Lee declared. "There is also a special wedding hat for the groom.

"When the ceremony is completed, the bride makes a series of bows to the members of the groom's family. They throw her dates, which she collects in her skirt, then hides in a pillow. The bride and groom will eat them together when they are alone. It is supposed to insure that the first child will be a son.

"The wedding celebration lasts three days. During that time, the bride is not supposed to do any work -- she must rest. The groom can do whatever he wants. They then remain to live in the groom's house."

Mrs. Lee joked that women's lib hit Korea many years before the United States since Korean women have always retained their maiden names. "I would not be Mrs. Lee in Korea," she stated. "I would remain Sang Yeon Kim. But my children would have the surname of Lee."

Dr. Lee, a pediatric surgeon, and his wife, a nurse at Redford Community Hospital, have four children who seem to have the best of both worlds -- Korean and American. Wook, 11, Joon, 9, Sue Ann, 8, and Mary Ann, 6, all attend Clay Elementary.

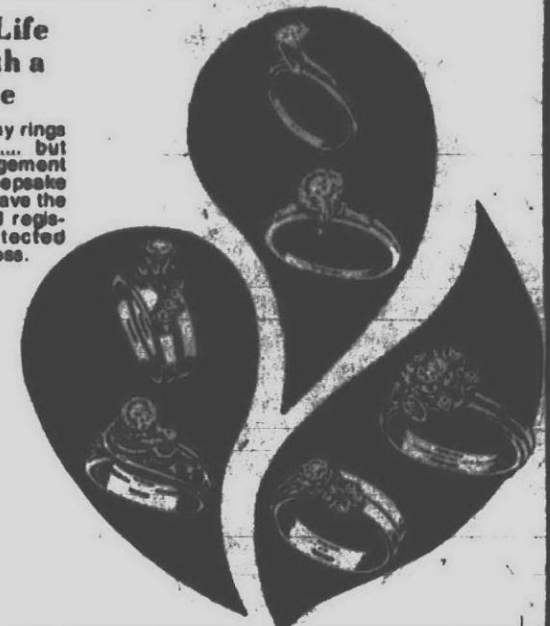

## Weddings... Israel

By JUDITH BERNE

Although visitors to Israel are often surprised to find many Israelis less religious than their American contemporaries, in the matter of marriage the old traditions still rule as dictated by Israeli law.

Adina Tzeel, who married her husband Josef 20 years ago in Tel Aviv, and who has lived in Southfield for the past five years, suggests that "marriages in Israel are more orthodox than most of the Jewish weddings in the United States."

"There is no civil marriage in Israel," Mrs. Tzeel, a teacher at a Jewish day school, related. "If you do not have a religious ceremony, then you cannot be married there -- you must go to another country."

"BEFORE THEY ARE MARRIED, the bride and groom must go the rabbinical -- a small hall where weddings are performed -- and show papers which prove they are single. Each needs two witnesses -- they must be men -- who will vouch for them."

For the more religious Jews in Israel, as for the ultra religious in the United States, before she is married the bride must go to the "mikvah" --

the public ritual bath, in order to become acceptably pure for her husband-to-be.

"And if the groom adheres strictly to the traditions, on the Saturday before his wedding he will go to the synagogue and publicly read a portion from the torah. When he is finished, candy and nuts are thrown from the audience, sweet things to wish him well."

Mrs. Tzeel reported that, "In Israel no one gets married in a synagogue."

"They either go to the rabbinical -- if they will have a small wedding -- or rent a larger hall. We do not have large synagogues and temples the way you do here. Our synagogues are only for praying."

"MOST ACTUAL MARRIAGES IN ISRAEL must be performed out-of-doors," Mrs. Tzeel continued. The theory is that the couple's children should be as numerous as the stars in the sky. The couple goes outside to the "chuppa" for the ceremony, then returns to the hall for the reception.

In the United States, Orthodox Jews also follow this tradition. But, according to Marcia Seligson in her book "The Eternal Bliss Machine," "an acceptable approximation for

Orthodox Jews has been provided ... In the room where ceremonies are held, a small hole has been cut out through the ceiling and the roof above, so that at least eleven stars peer through."

Mrs. Tzeel noted that before the wedding, the bride sits with her mother and prospective mother-in-law in a special seat generally adorned with flowers. "Everybody comes up to wish her well."

"In the meantime, the groom is seated in another place with the rabbis and both fathers for the purpose of signing 'the marriage contract'. He will support her -- in everything -- he pledges. In case he ever wants to let her go he must pay a symbolic sum of money."

"When this is accomplished, he comes toward the bride accompanied by their fathers, and covers her face with a veil. The fathers then escort him outside to the chuppa."

"The chuppa," according to author Seligson, "is one of those nuptial traditions that has interesting multiple symbolic meaning, depending on whom you talk to. Some historians claim it derives from the groom's tent, where the marriage was consummated, then became the mark of the new home to be created by the couple." Others believe "it was a symbol for the protection of the couple from evil forces from above. It used to be a piece of velvet held up on four sides by four men..." In Israel, the chuppa is usually

made of a special fabric held aloft  
by four poles.

"The bride is escorted to the  
chuppa by the mothers," Mrs. Tzeel  
continued. "Friends and relatives  
hold candles to 'light the way.' The  
people who accompany the bride  
and groom must be married to one  
another. Thus, if one of the parents  
of either the bride and groom are  
deceased, then another married  
couple in the family takes their  
place.

"There are no attendants -- no  
best man, maid of honor, brides-  
maids or ushers like you have here.  
Only the parents, or the next closest  
married couple in the family, take  
part in the ceremony.

"THE BRIDE CIRCLES the  
groom seven times before she  
comes and takes her place next to  
him at his right side in some cere-  
monies."

Mrs. Tzeel described the cere-  
mony itself as much the same as many  
Jewish ceremonies here, though it is  
spoken entirely in Hebrew and  
Aramic (old Hebrew).

"But it is not a double ceremony,"  
she cautioned. "He gives her the  
ring and speaks 'With this ring I  
thee wed according to the law of  
Moses and Israel.' He then breaks  
the glass with his foot -- a symbol in  
Jewish weddings throughout the  
world. She is silent.

"When the wine is sipped by the  
bride and groom, her veil must be  
lifted off her face by a woman; it is  
not allowable for the groom to do it."

Following the ceremony, there  
may be any kind of celebration from  
a small kiddush where the partici-  
pants share wine, challah (a bread)  
and cake to a large and lavish re-  
ception and dinner.

"There is always a special challah  
and wine," Mrs. Tzeel said. "The  
rabbi, fathers and the bride and  
groom make seven blessings. In an-  
cient times a wedding was cele-  
brated for seven days.

"At the celebration, the bride and  
groom may be placed in chairs,  
hoisted high into the air and held  
aloft by merry dancers.

"Sometimes the men and women  
do not dance together at all," she  
noted, "for with the very strict Ortho-  
dox Jews it is forbidden to touch  
one another on this occasion. For  
the less religious, a man and woman  
will dance holding a handkerchief  
between them, so that they touch  
the handkerchief and not each other."

When Mrs. Tzeel returned to Is-  
rael for a visit, she noticed that "they  
are gradually bringing in American

customs in marriage just as they are  
in other facets of life."

Although in Israel not everyone  
has a car, they now may rent a car  
for a wedding and decorate it with  
flowers, as they have seen in the  
United States. "Usually the photo-  
grapher arranges it."

As she remembers wedding in-  
vitations were always sent, but you  
did not expect a reply. "People ei-  
ther came or they didn't. But now,  
Mrs. Tzeel reported, she saw in-  
vitations that required a response --  
as in the U.S.

In the United States, as in many  
countries, the expense of the wed-  
ding generally falls to the bride's  
family. Not so in Israel. "Both sets of  
parents usually share in the costs of  
a wedding, according to what they  
can manage."

**GIFTS ARE BROUGHT** person-  
ally to the home of the bride or may  
be given at the wedding itself, she  
continued. These are generally  
store-bought items, and even more  
often money is given.

Weddings at the kibbutzim  
throughout Israel may be different  
than what Mrs. Tzeel has described.  
"A whole group of couples may get  
married in sort of an assembly line  
fashion on the day the rabbi makes  
a visit," she said.

"Sometimes a kibbutz will send a  
special bus to the city to pick up  
family, friends -- and the rabbi --  
for either a single or group wed-  
ding. Although there may not be a  
formal reception, there is much  
dancing, singing and kissing the  
bride."

Both on the kibbutz and in the  
city, there are several days during  
the year on which there may be a  
line-up of people getting married.  
For 50 days during the spring be-  
tween the celebrations of Passover  
and Shavuot there is a traditional  
period of mourning for Jews and no  
one is allowed to marry during most  
of this period.

The exceptions are on the first  
day of a Jewish month, the 33rd day,  
Lag-baomer, of the period and on  
Israel's Independence Day. Among  
conservative and Orthodox Jews in  
this country, the same custom is  
observed.

Is there a special day of the week  
on which there are more marriages?  
Surprisingly, there is, according  
to Mrs. Tzeel. "Tuesday is consid-  
ered 'a nicer day,' she said. In the  
Torah, God was supposed to have  
blessed that day twice. My husband  
and I were married on a Tuesday."

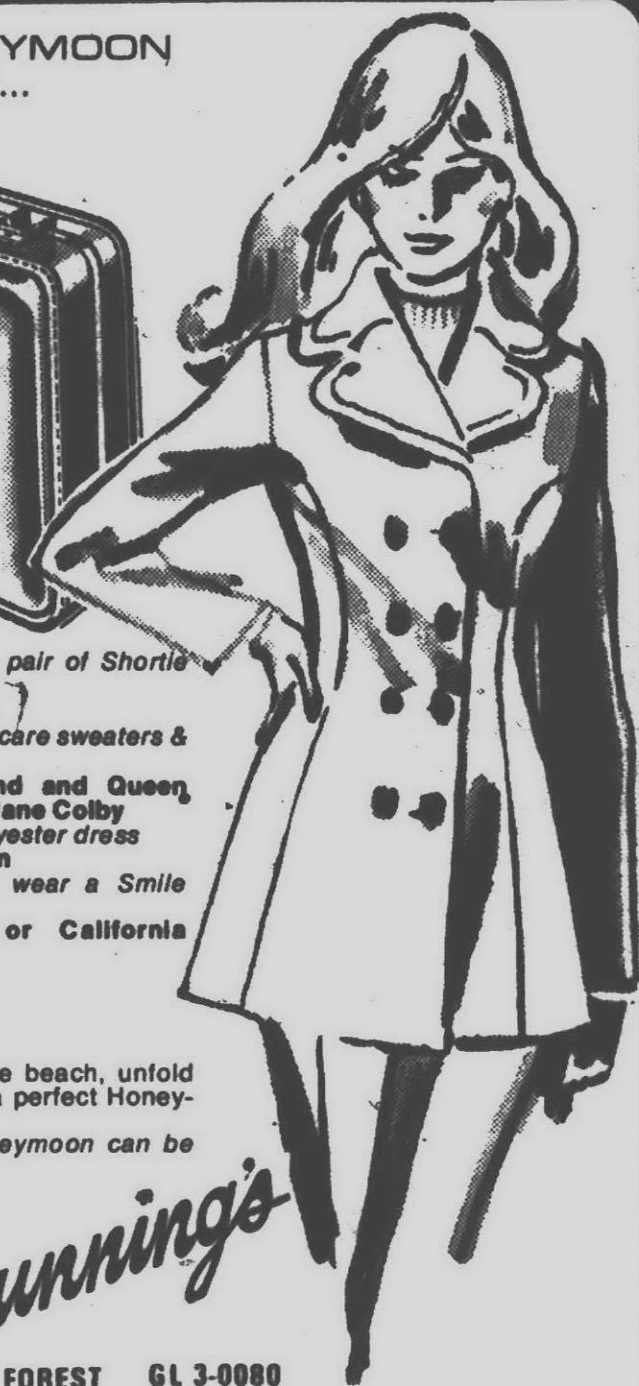
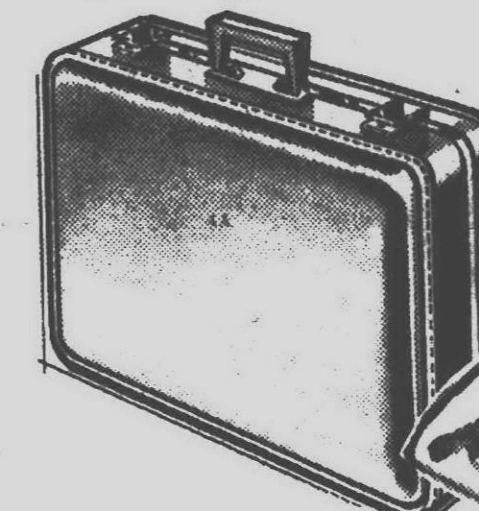

## the Bridal Shower...

In many countries there is no such thing as a bridal shower.

In the United States, it seems that most brides are given at least one -- and sometimes more -- of these affairs. Showers devoted to kitchen gadgets, lingerie and miscellaneous gifts are common.

The bar shower has become quite popular with guests helping the bride and groom to stock their wine and liquor cabinets. Very often these are co-ed affairs, moving away from the traditional all female showers.

IN THE PAST, showers were usually held at lunchtime, or in the early afternoon, but with most young women working today, a late afternoon or early evening affair is a wise choice. Whichever time of day you choose, a tea party is still one of the nicest settings for a shower.

But don't just stop at serving tea and cake. With the wide variety of premium teas available on the market, you can have lots of fun with tea tasting.

Have each guest bring two or three teacups, along with her shower gift. Collect a number of pretty teapots and provide delicate pastry or tea sandwiches.

The hostess might brew three or four varieties of tea, each with its own distinctive and characteristic flavor, and have guests sample them.

IN ORDER TO APPRECIATE the rich flavor of fine tea, there's only one correct way to brew it.

- Preheat an earthenware or China teapot by rinsing with hot water.

- Add teabags or loose tea to the pot.

- Bring freshly drawn water to a rolling boil, then pour over the tea.

To extract full flavor from the tea leaves, let stand for length of time recommended on package and stir before pouring.

In considering gifts for the bride-to-be, you might keep in mind the entertaining she'll be doing once she sets up her new home. With the increasing popularity of tea-drinking among people under thirty, chances are she'll be serving tea to many of her guests. She'll appreciate a pretty teapot, or tea set.

If you want to be less conventional, you might present her with an antique tea strainer or a tiny teaball for a single cup of tea. With any of these, a welcome addition would be a selection of fine teas.

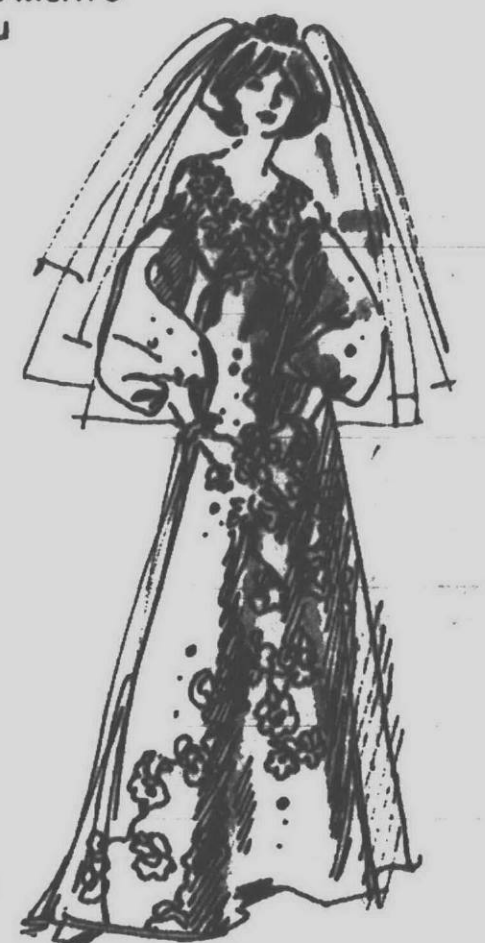

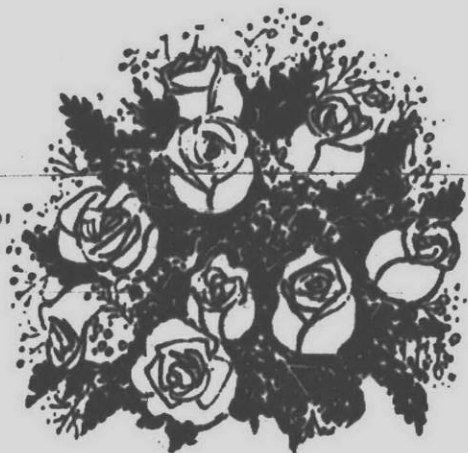

## Wedding Cakes, cont'd.

### ENGLAND

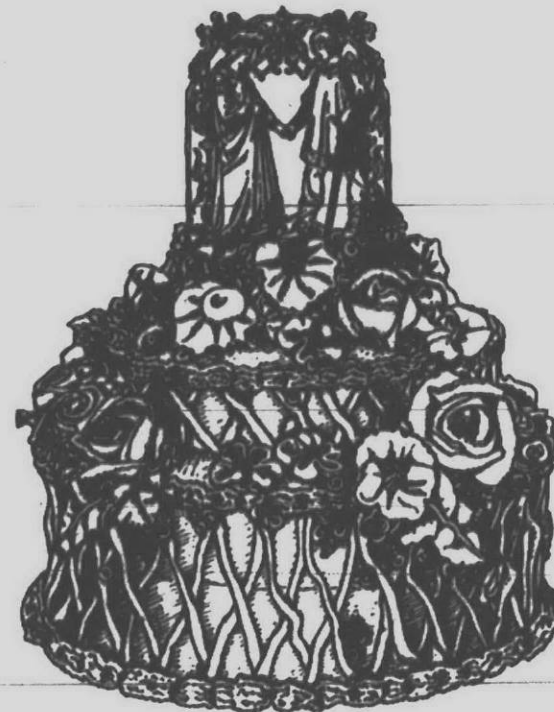
½ lb. marzipan with a little white of egg  
½ lb. vegetable fat  
½ lb. butter  
1 lb. barbados or demerara sugar  
little burnt sugar or caramel  
8 large eggs  
1 lb. 2 oz. flour  
4 lb. currants  
¼ lb. (1 cup cut mixed peel)  
2 cups glace cherries  
1 lb. sultanas

Soften the marzipan with a little white of egg and then cream with the vegetable fat, butter and the barbados or demerara sugar till creamy and light. Now to ensure the right color add the burnt sugar or caramel.

Beat in the eggs, one at a time, till the mixture becomes light and fluffy. Now fold in the flour, but take care not to overmix at this stage. Finally add the currants, sultanas, cut mixed peel and the glace cherries.

Owing to the very rich nature of this mixture with so much fruit and sugar, it is advisable to bake at a slightly lower temperature than for fruit cake.

The oven should be at 280-300° F. and 1 lb. cakes should be left in the oven for 1 hour and 10 minutes. The flavor of the wedding cake is greatly enhanced if it is sprinkled with a mixture of rum and rose water as soon as it comes out of the oven.



### HUNGARY

In Hungary, there are no wedding cakes, but in days past the rich Hungarian peasants made a very big wedding gateau three or four feet high, covered with white icing and decorated with crockant (ground almonds and sugar caramelized till light brown and beat into "S" shaped ribbons). A four foot crockant was erected in the middle of the cake and decorated like a tower. Orange blossoms or white roses completed the decorations.

In the Netherlands, the groom picks his bride up at her home in a horse-drawn carriage and together they drive to the church for their wedding ceremony.

Wilma Vorwerk, who spent the 1971-72 school year as a senior at Farmington High and returned this summer for a two-month visit, to the Glen Mingo family of Farmington, described the picturesque procession which she has seen so often in her native Hertogenbosch—a small town one hour southeast of Amsterdam.

"It is a beautiful sight—the line of carriages traveling down the narrow streets—the groom at the head... Their carriage is decorated inside with beautiful white flowers... He stops at her door, she enters the carriage and the procession continues... The church bells ring and everyone knows who it is for.

"RELIGIOUS WEDDING CEREMONIES almost always take place in the morning in the Netherlands," Wilma continued in a more matter of fact manner. "I don't really know why. Perhaps it is because the couple must also have a short civil ceremony the same day," she speculated. "And they will usually have a reception."

"I think they start early so they can get everything in," she laughed.

Although the religious ceremony is very much the same as in the United States, depending on the denomination, the customs surrounding the ceremony are somewhat different in the Netherlands.

For one thing there are no big dinners or luncheons or formal receptions. According to Wilma there is almost always an afternoon reception where there are drinks and "small things to eat." But it is not usually by invitation. "It is more or less an open house type of thing. If you hear about it, you can go."

"The reception would never be held in the church," she cautioned. "There would be no place to have it. Churches here are so much more social."

"If there is a dinner—because people have to eat—it would be for out-of-town people and maybe the wedding party."

Wilma had never seen rice thrown at the end of the ceremony until she attended a wedding in the United States. "In Holland, we throw real flowers or sometimes paper petals," she explained.

"Here you have what you call 'showers' before the marriage," she went on. "Where I'm from there is no such thing. People usually bring wedding gifts to the reception."

Sometime during the wedding day, the couple must go to the Town Hall for their civil marriage. "Several weeks before, they have gone there to fill out the forms telling that they will be married," Wilma related. "This is called 'under-married'."

THE CIVIL CEREMONY ITSELF is often performed en masse—with several couples participating. "It is cheaper that way, you see," Wilma explained. "Your parents must sign. You do not need the religious ceremony, but you must have the civil to be married in the eyes of the country."

"Yes, there are quite a number of persons who only have the civil ceremony, especially these days," the blonde Wilma said. "They get married in pant suits or short dresses. I just happened to pass the Town Hall one day, and saw a couple in blue jeans get off their bikes and go in. It was obvious from all the excitement surrounding them that they were to be married."

Wilma reported that the act of "engagement" is gaining popularity in the Netherlands, after a long period in which "you didn't hear about getting engaged. There was something really old-fashioned about it; people didn't feel it was necessary any more."

Now, as more and more young people are studying in different places—both throughout the Netherlands and in other countries—engagement is coming back. "I think that they like the security of knowing they are engaged when they are apart from one another."

Although Amsterdam is famous for its diamond industry, the attractive Dutch girl said that among the people she knows the engagement stone is rarely a diamond. "Quite often the ring has been made by the groom. Or it is a semi-precious stone."

In the United States, the groom often chooses not to wear a wedding band; Wilma notes that in her country the man always wears one.

COUPLES FROM THE NETHERLANDS are just as anxious to take a honeymoon trip as American couples. "Paris is the place to go," Wilma reports, "just like Acapulco is here."

"Almost all the young married people move into apartments—although they are not always their own," she continued. "Young people want to live in the cities... the universities are usually in the center of the city. Apartments are very scarce. They often have to move in with their parents for awhile, until they can locate a vacancy."

For herself, 19-year-old Wilma feels marriage is definitely a thing of the future, although a number of her friends have recently married. "There is an awful large group that does get married young, but more and more people are getting married older."

"Of course there are still those who have to get married. Abortion is available, but they usually don't want it."

Would she want a large elaborate wedding for herself? "It's not my dream. I would like a lot of people there, and a reception... but it wouldn't have to be done expensively."

"I don't even know if I'd want a long white dress. I don't really like the formality of it."

Of her stay in the United States, "It will definitely influence my life. There are things from here that I'd like to introduce in my country. There are things from my country I'd like to see here. I'd like to combine the good in both."

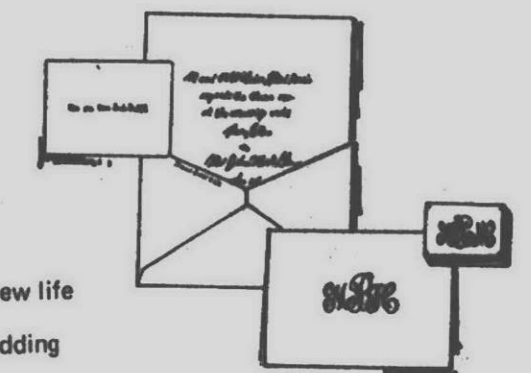

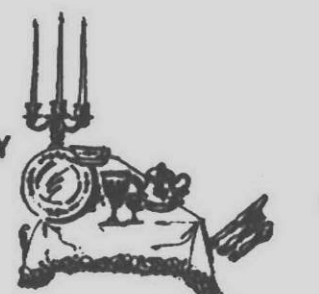

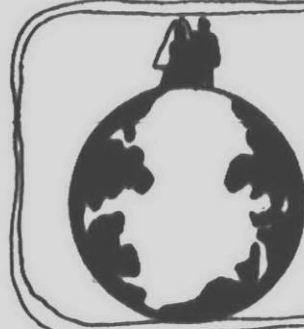

## Weddings... Turkey

Marriage customs, like life in general in Turkey's capital city of Istanbul, are probably not what you think they are.

If you have notions of bride and groom, swathed in robes and veils, traveling to their wedding destination on a caravan of camels, you couldn't be more wrong.

Ramazan Ban and his wife, Bayhan, now residents of Westland, were married 11 years ago in a manner typical of many of their former countrymen.

Their actual wedding ceremony was a civil one, conducted in Istanbul by a judge in a municipal building. According to the Bans, all couples must be married in this way under Turkish law.

A brief religious ceremony can be conducted in a private home afterwards, if the families so desire. For Mohammedans this means a reading of parts of the Koran, done by an Imam, who functions as the minister or priest.

Mosques, Mohammedan places of worship, are not used for marriage ceremonies, at all, according to the Bans.

WEDDING ATTIRE, like everyday

clothing in Istanbul, is completely westernized. For her civil marriage ceremony, Bayhan Ban chose a white street length dress, and for the festivity afterward she donned a full length bridal gown topped by a short veil. Her husband looked no different from an ordinary American bridegroom.

The days when Turkish men covered themselves in Arabic style robes and headdresses and women's faces were hidden by veils, are gone forever. Largely responsible for his country's increased westernization in dress and social customs was Mustafa Kemal, the first President of Turkish democracy, who was elected to office over 50 years ago.

Wedding festivities in Istanbul are as varied as they are in this country. The Bans' wedding party was a super large one held in a banquet hall with about 600 guests. Both modern music and old Turkish folk melodies were played, thus emphasizing the flavors of both the old and the new worlds.

A colossal wedding cake, again western in appearance, was served to the huge number of guests, but the Bans themselves shared their own small cake at a table for two

Mix ingredients well in order given into a stiff paste. Heat the mixture but do not let it boil in the top of a double boiler over hot water.

Make the layers of the cake as follows -- Roll paste into rings about 1/2 inch thick, taking enough of the mix at one time to make the size ring you wish. Pinch off the end of the dough before you close the circle to make the ring just a fraction smaller than the previous one. Lay out as many rings as you plan to have.

Butter and dust the cookie sheets with flour. Lay the rings on the sheets after they have been shaped. With your fingers, squeeze the tops of the rings enough to make them somewhat pointed in the center to build the foundation for the smaller ring which will top each.

Bake in a slow oven, preheated to 250°, until edges are browned -- place on a rack to cool. Frost between layers as follows:

Royal icing

4 egg whites

1 1/2 cups powdered sugar

Beat ingredients by hand until stiff. Squeeze out through a pastry bag to decorate each ring before putting the cake together.

1 1/2 cup unsalted butter

12 eggs

1 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour

Double recipe pastry cream

1 1/2 cups sugar

2 tsp. vanilla

2 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour

1 1/2 cups apricot jam

1/2 Cup Kirsch

Triple recipe white confectionary frosting

candied violets

silver candy balls

Make and bake a 12-inch pastry round. Regulate the oven to 350° F.

Melt butter over hot water; let it cool. Rinse out a large mixing bowl with hot water and wrap it in a hot wet towel. Beat the eggs, sugar and vanilla in warm bowl for five minutes. Continue beating, adding butter gradually. Fold flour in gradually, lifting the batter to introduce as much air as possible. Pour the batter into three tins -- buttered and dusted with flour. Bake 30 to 40 minutes until done.

Make pastry cream while cake is baking, flavor with kirsch and let cool.

Cut each cooled cake horizontally into three layers. Spread the layers alternately with pastry cream and apricot jam mixed with kirsch. Leave the tops of each cake plain.

Reform the cakes and using unbeaten egg white or a little apricot jam as glue, place the cakes on top -- using the largest as base and the tall one on top.

Make a triple recipe of a favorite confectionary frosting.

The French recipe calls for pouring the frosting over the top cake and letting it fall over the bottom ones, smoothing the frosting into place with a knife dipped in hot water.

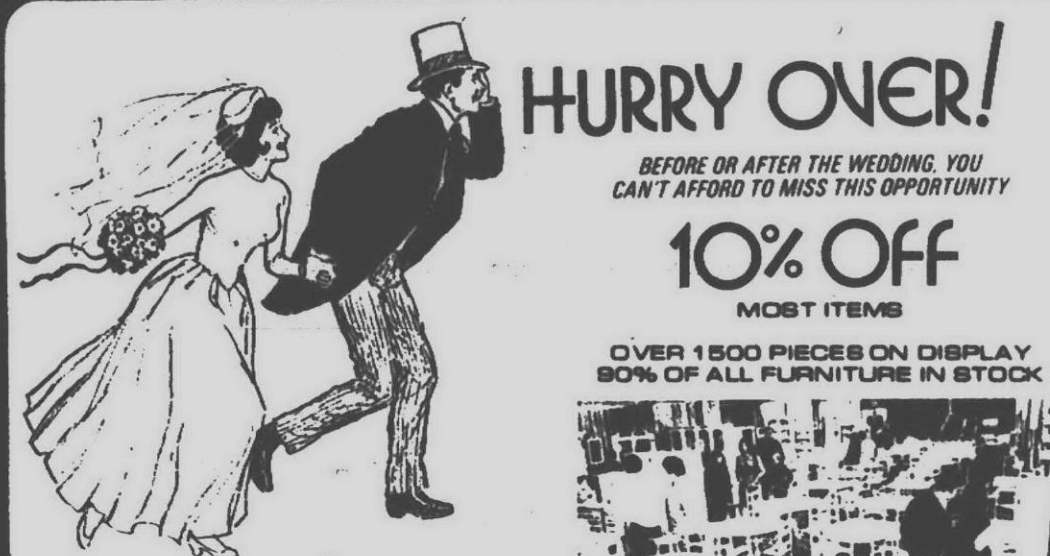

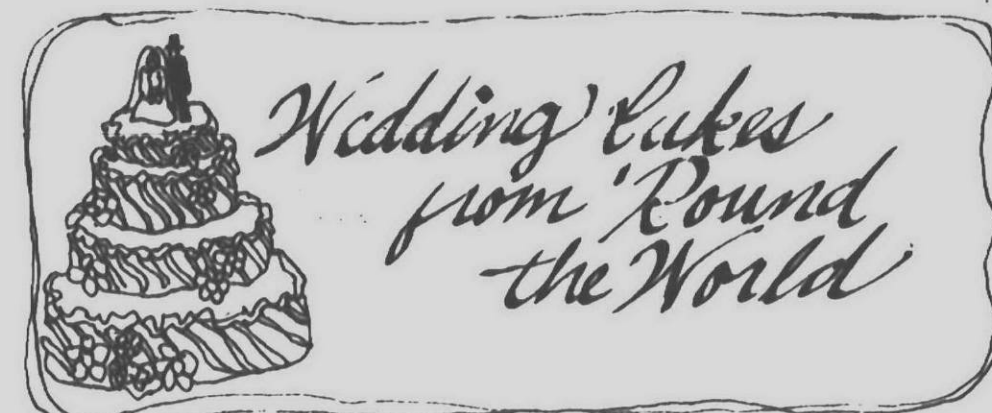

Wedding cakes -- the symbol of the American wedding -- have a long tradition, but in many countries there is no such concoction.

History tells us that the early Romans prepared a cake -- actually a loaf of bread made of barley -- as an offering to the god Jupiter. After sharing a piece, the groom broke what was left over his bride's head partly to show the dominance of the male over the female. Guests took the leftover crumbs home for luck and to ensure their own fruitfulness.

Anglo-Saxon weddings replaced bread with small hard biscuits, and in the Middle Ages these gave way to sweet small buns brought by the wedding guests and stacked in a high mound in front of the newlyweds. The custom was for the couple to try to kiss over the mound, and if successful, they were assured of lifelong prosperity and great numbers of children.

The Restoration period saw the transition from sweet bun to solid confection. Charles II, returning to England from exile in France, brought with him French pastry chefs who completed the cake evolution by icing solid squares with a

crust of hardened sugar, then topping the mound with toys and figures.

What we think of today as the wedding cake is actually the "bride's cake" -- frilly, decorative, not meant to be eaten. Its counterpart -- the groom's cake -- was dark, often a fruitcake.

Here are a few recipes from countries which feature wedding cakes:

## DENMARK Kransekage

This cake consists of at least 20 rings called "kranse," of gradual sizes, placed on top of each other to make a cone. It is decorated with four large candles and as many smaller ones as you wish. White birds and candy flowers in gay colors of the bride's choice are stuck on the cake with melted sugar. The traditional miniature bride and groom decorate the top.

which was their special place of honor at the festivities.

Other foods apt to be part of a gala wedding feast in Turkey are shish-ke-bob -- always made with lamb -- stuffed grape leaves or dolma, pilaf, varieties of cheeses, and sweets including baklava and Turkish delight. Potent Turkish whiskey, made from raisins, is traditionally served as well.

**ANCIENT FOLK DANCES** like the hora and all male sword dancing usually liven up the atmosphere at Turkish weddings, but guests are just as likely to do the very latest dance crazes that are an up to the minute part of the 20th Century.

The main difference between Turkish and American wedding customs is probably found in courtship patterns.

According to Ramazan and Bay-

han Ban, many Turkish marriages are still arranged by families. The bride and groom usually know each other on their wedding day, having become acquainted beforehand by a number of specially arranged meetings. It was in this way that the Bans themselves got to know each other.

What happens if, as a result of their get togethers, a couple just doesn't hit it off? Nothing! They may each go their own separate ways and there is no pressure for them to marry each other.

But if they have no objections, plans for an ensuing marriage are undertaken by their families, and soon enough they become man and wife.

Bridal showers are not given in Turkey, according to the Bans, but wedding guests bring gifts for the newly married couple to the festivities.

**THE BRIDE'S FAMILY** customarily provides the bedroom furniture for the couple, and the groom's family purchases the living room suite for the new household.

The Bans and their two children, James, 10, and Selma, 8, have just returned from a visit to Istanbul. Movies taken on the trip reveal a modern metropolis complete with high rise apartment buildings and super highways. A new bridge connecting the city to Asia will create a whole new pattern of activity in itself.

Long a common meeting ground and melting pot for both the cultures of East and West, the city's sophistication is reflected not only in its marriage customs but in its entire urbane pace of life.

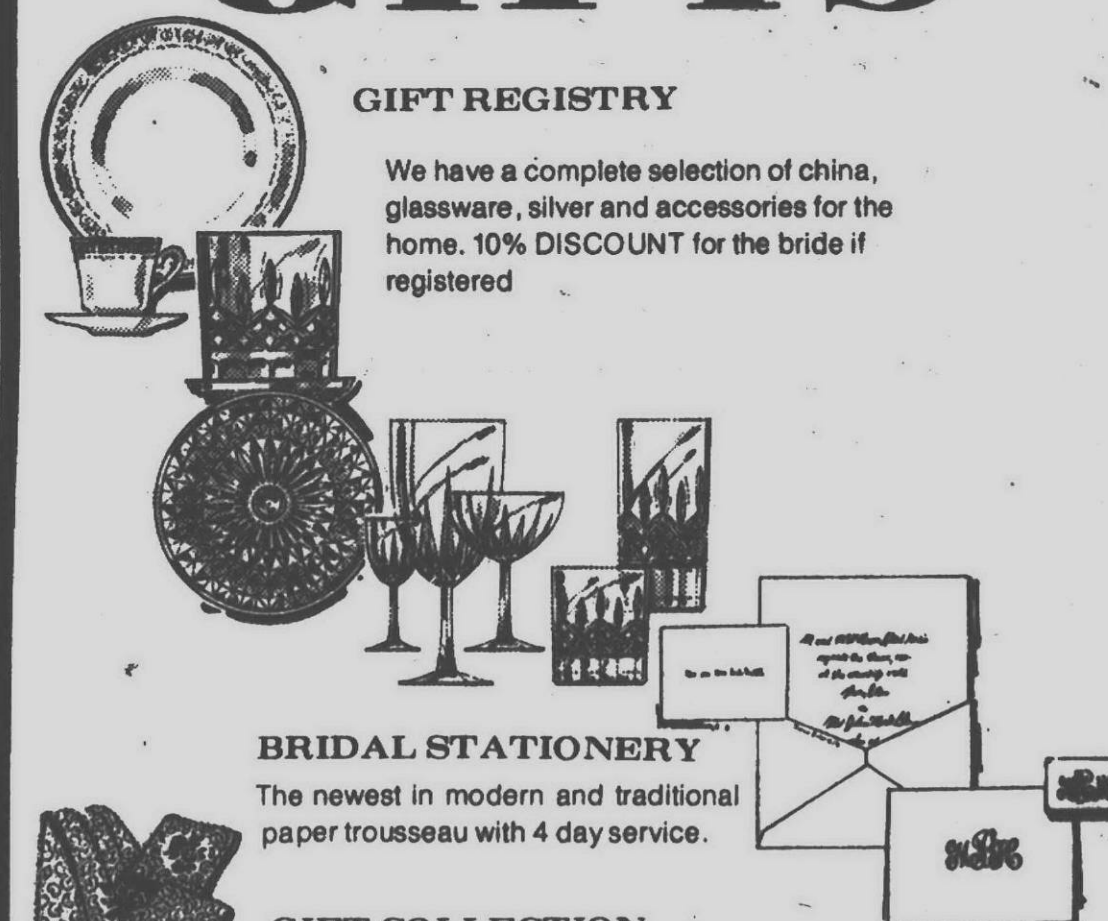

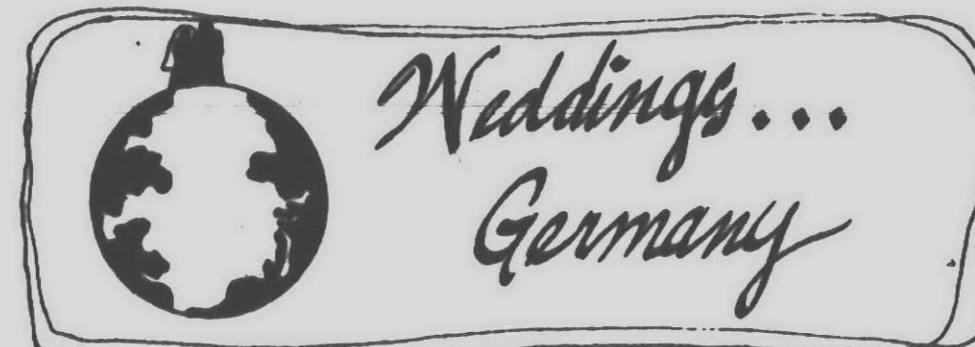

Two years ago, Fran Evert of Farmington, traveled to Bremen, Germany, specifically to attend the marriage of Guenter Stammerjohns, a former German exchange student at Farmington High School.

Mrs. Evert, a free-lance photographer, found that picture-taking for a wedding in Germany was quite different from what she was used to here, as were other of the marriage customs.

"I entered the reception hall, following the ceremony, my camera poised to take a picture of the bride," Mrs. Evert related. "I was greeted by shouts of 'Nein, nein.' The bride's mother informed me that it is bad luck to take a picture of the bride alone.

"PICTURES OF THE BRIDE AND GROOM taken at the ceremony were developed and presented at the reception later that same day," Mrs. Evert continued. "You know how long you often wait for the pictures here. They were actually postcards and all in black and white. Of course, they may have them enlarged later -- I just don't know."

Although in the United States, a lot of time is spent taking a number of shots with various members of

the family and wedding attendants grouped around the bride and groom, this was not true at the wedding Mrs. Evert attended.

"The whole family was photographed in one group shot and that was it."

When Mrs. Evert arrived in Bremen, accompanied by Mildred Lake -- Guenter's American "mother" while he was living in Farmington, they were met by Guenter and his bride-to-be, Val, who had just completed their "civil marriage."

On the day prior to the religious ceremony, a German couple is married by a magistrate, "who does nothing else but perform marriages." The religious ceremony is optional, but the civil is mandatory as prescribed by German law.

Although the civil ceremony was celebrated with a family dinner, the bride and groom did not consider themselves man and wife until the religious rites have been performed, Mrs. Evert carefully noted.

"On the morning of the wedding day it is customary for friends and neighbors to send 'blooms' to the bride's home." She described these as loosely arranged bouquets of flowers, generally home-grown. "In Germany everybody grows flowers.

government, there is no way of being married in a church. If we had been married there, I can't say whether it would have been allowed.

"A church wedding was always my dream."

"If they go to church, they have beautiful dresses. . . there are no seats . . . everyone stands. . . the bride and groom walk together down the aisle . . . they hold candles and make a circle . . . at the end, they leave the candles and exchange rings . . . the rings are worn on the right hand.

"There is a best man and a maid of honor, but no other attendants. The groom and many of the men wear a small branch from a pine tree on their lapels.



"After the ceremony, they come out of the church, and the best man throws coins out for the children to gather. The custom has a name. It is translated 'best man your bag is burning.'"

Saveta said that those who do not get married in church go to a special office. "They may not wear a wedding dress . . . sometimes just a skirt and blouse. The same words are spoken."

"No matter where you are married, there is usually a celebration afterwards, she continued. "What that celebration is depends on how well off you are.

Saveta explained that people bring flowers to the bride before the wedding and money or presents afterward.

"The bride and groom pay close attention to what they get. There, they do not have as much as we do here, so every gift is important.

"You don't send thank you note cards. You thank people when they give the gift. We don't have as much formality."

More often than not, according to Saveta, there is no honeymoon. "It's just not something many can afford. Sometimes a couple will go for a few days to the sea."

However, there is in Yugoslavia a "Honeymoon Day." It is on a specified date each year and is for all couples married during that year. "Relatives usually bake special cookies and small cakes -- honeymoon cakes -- and take them to the couple. There is a small party."

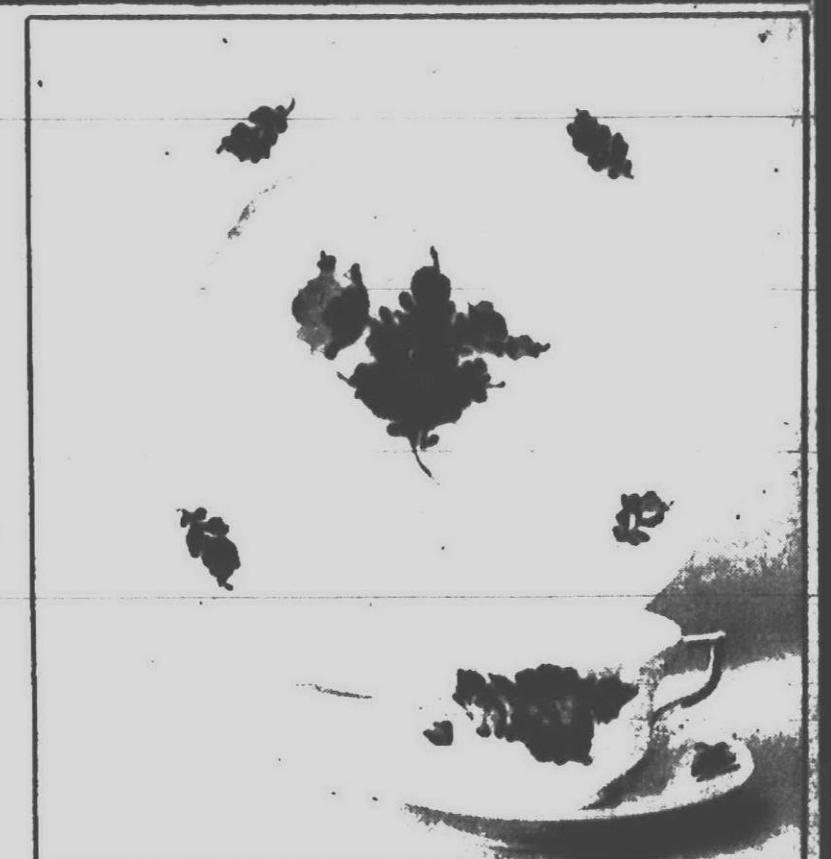
Saveta, who is 21, reported that in Yugoslavia the average age for marriage would be about 27.

Saveta and Mitch live in an apartment in Westland, but she does not take this for granted. "In my country, lots of married people live with their parents -- sometimes for their whole lives. Apartments are so expensive and there aren't enough of them."

Of her life in the United States, including her first year of marriage -- "It is everything I expected it to be."

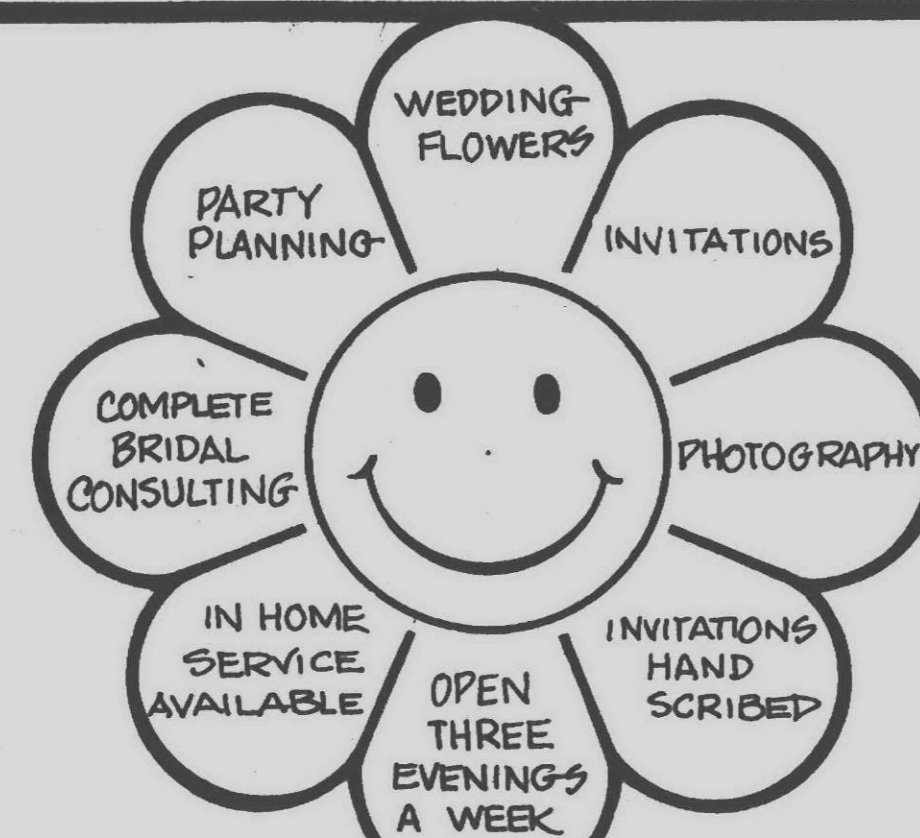

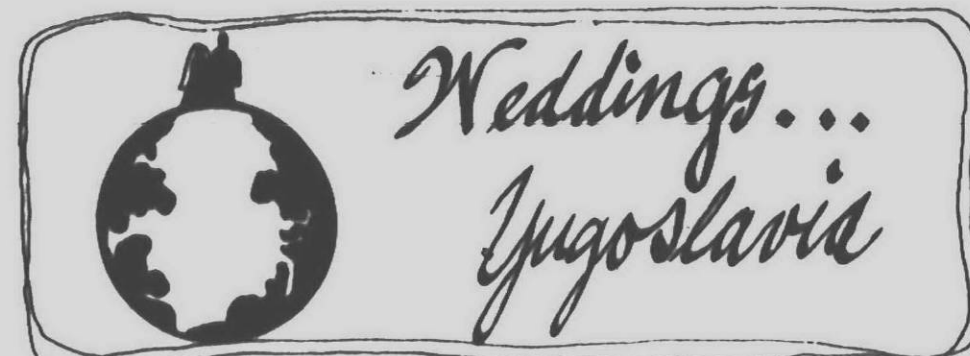

Saveta Jovanovich Eidemiller of Belgrade, Yugoslavia, quickly learned what the American way of marriage was all about -- at her very own wedding.

**AN EXCHANGE STUDENT** at Farmington High during the year 1971-72, Saveta met and married Mitchell Eidemiller within a three month period.

"We didn't plan it that way," Saveta explained. "We planned to go to my country so he could meet my family, then he would return here and I would join him."

"But we found out that because of the papers I had signed allowing me to come for a year as an exchange student, I wouldn't be allowed to return to the United States for two years."

"We couldn't wait that long -- we made our wedding plans in two weeks."

By a happy coincidence, Saveta's father was visiting relatives in Canada -- whom he hadn't seen in 20 years -- and they all attended the wedding. "My father was very sad when he first heard about it," Saveta said. "But after he met Mitch, I think he became happy for me."

She described their wedding at the Our Lady of Refuge Church in Orchard Lake as "more like an

American ceremony." But at the reception following there were some Yugoslavian foods, Yugoslavian music and dancing and a special Yugoslavian custom.

"It was one of my Canadian uncle's ideas," Saveta related. "In my country, those who dance with the bride or groom must give money -- for the privilege you see. So we got out a basket, and those who danced with us put in a little something."

**GUESTS ALSO JOINED** in dancing "the kolo" -- a circle dance usually performed at Yugoslavian weddings. "The circle eventually becomes one long line, and everyone follows all around," Saveta said. "It is the national dance."

She carefully explained that it is difficult to describe Yugoslavian wedding customs in a general way, because they are different in each section of her country. Yugoslavia is divided into six republics and each republic has its own style.

"You do not need an invitation to attend a wedding in my country," Saveta related. "Anyone can come, and many do just to kiss the bride and pay their respects."

"Many do not have a church wedding. If you are a member of the Communist party, or work for the

If they do not have at least a small garden, then they have a window box.

"The 'blooms' were everywhere around the living room. It is a lovely tradition."

**GIFTS WERE GIVEN** both at the bride's home and at the reception. "Their finest gifts were hand-sewn featherbed coverings," Mrs. Evert explained. The covers were made of the finest linen -- like we put on our table." In Germany one sleeps on a featherbed, while a second featherbed is used for a cover.

"Gifts came wrapped in lovely tissue papers -- more fragile than the papers we use for wrapping. A good many presents were home made -- needlework or other handicrafts. They were considered dearer than store bought gifts."

"There was a lot of pewter -- I didn't see silver."

Mrs. Evert recalled that the groom saw the bride the morning of the religious ceremony, although he did not see her in her wedding gown until the rites began.

"The whole family followed the couple down the aisle -- mother, father, sisters, brothers, aunts and uncles. Then they were seated, and the bride, groom and attendants went to the altar."

"The ceremony itself -- Lutheran -- was little different than the weddings Mrs. Evert has attended in the United States -- as far as her small amount of German could tell. But the reception and dinner following quickly brought the differences in tradition to mind."

"The bride and groom greeted each guest with a glass of wine," Mrs. Evert said.

**A SIT-DOWN DINNER** was followed by dancing and later a midnight lunch. I had never been at a

party where two meals were served! "The Germans build their meals around potatoes and bread," Mrs. Evert described, "including a wedding dinner." She could not recall a wedding cake -- but lots and lots of breads and fine pastries.

"During the party the bride and groom moved from table to table greeting their guests, much as we do here," Mrs. Evert continued. "But accompanying them was a bottle of Schnapps and a pewter spoon. Each guest had to sip a spoonful and repeat a rhyme. I flunked when it was my turn."

"Later the couple danced in the center of a large circle made by friends and relatives. Then the single fellows placed the bride in a chair, lifted it up into the air and twirled it around."

"As they put her down, they took her veil and tore it into shreds. The story is that the single man with the largest veil piece will have the best luck."

His friends come and throw the crockery symbolizing 'a breaking of the past'. When the prospective groom hears the merry-making, he comes out and offers them a drink. It is in the bachelor party tradition."

**ONE OF THE SIGHTS** was a plot of land where Guenter and his wife -- an architect -- planned to build their home. "She showed me her plans for the house, including where the children's rooms would be. She told me it was not at all unusual for a woman in Germany to be an architect."

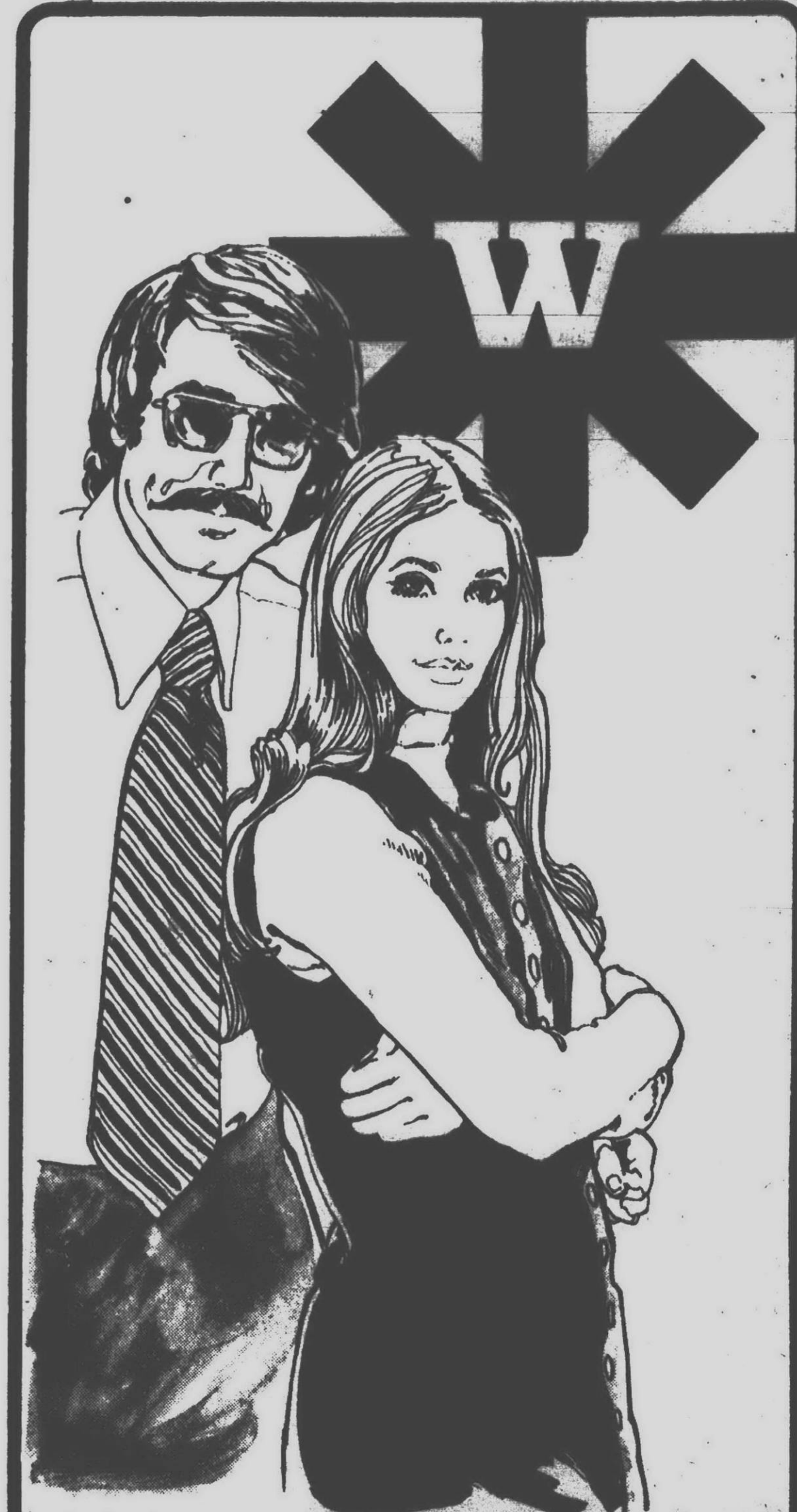

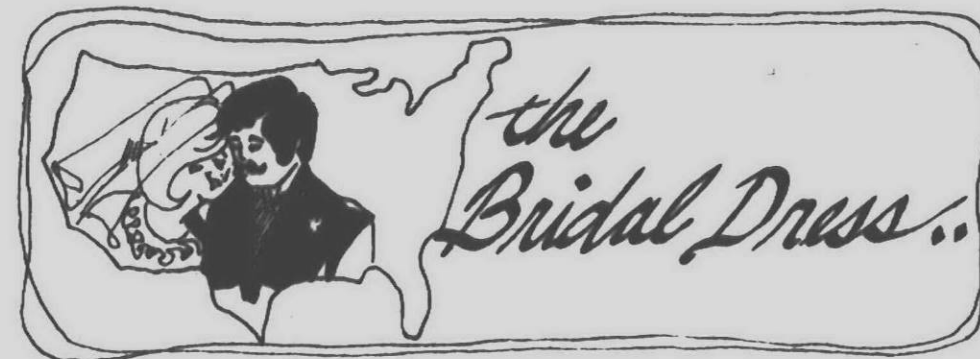

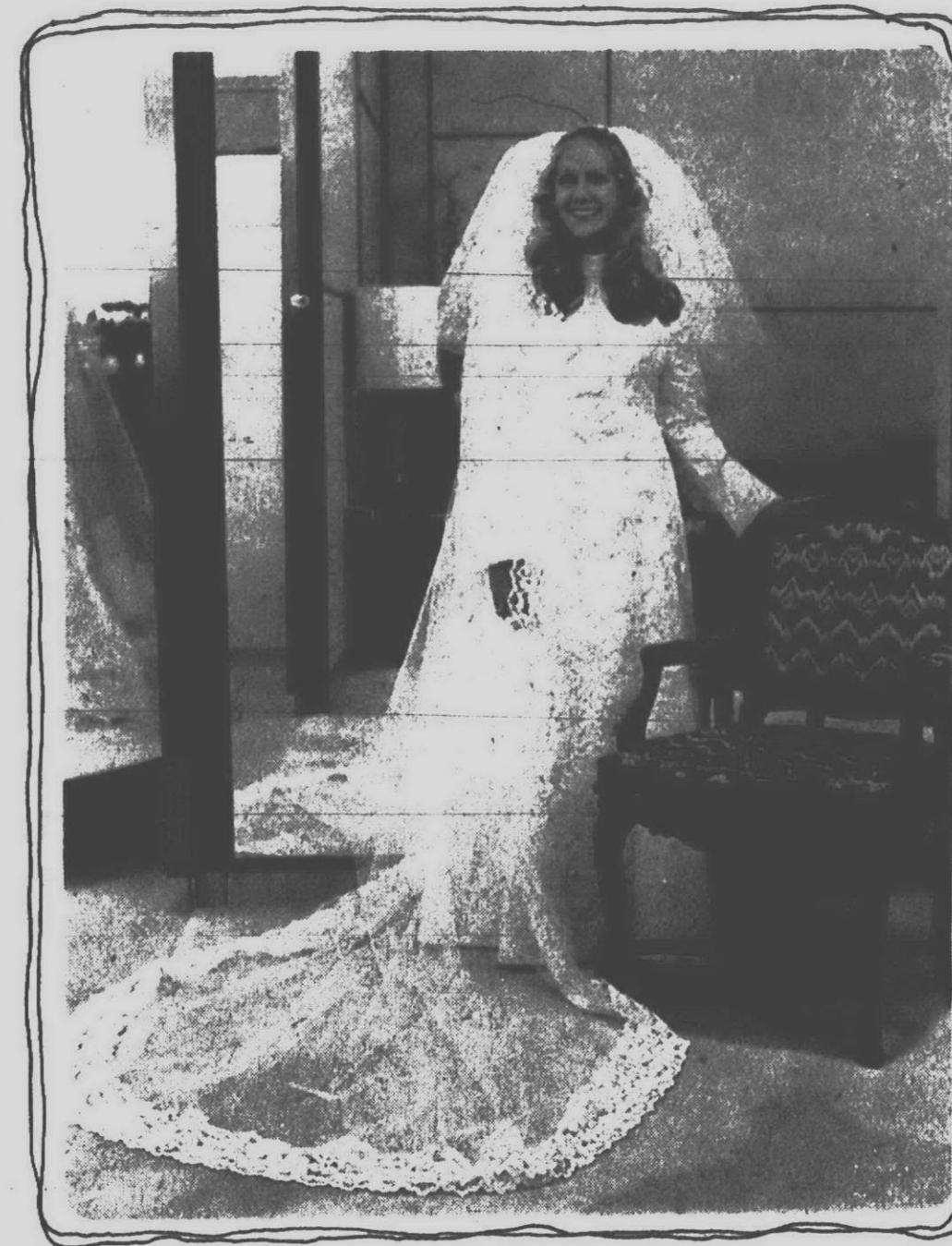
