Yoekey, who is also a member of the authority board, opened his remarks at the commission meeting by criticizing the other members of the authority board for not asking him to sign or advising him of the letter.

The letter to the commission cited seven "advantages" of a recreation authority and two "specific advantages to the city."

Signed by the authority board members as individuals -- not as an official action -- the letter offered "our consideration for future help in defraying some of the programming cost" of the city's Cultural Center, which has been running in the red since

Debate between the commissioners and the authority board members grew heated at some points.

Commissioner McAninci who made the motion against signing the authority agreement, said the comm change in heart from its initial pledge was because the commission hoped the authority could provide additional facilities for recreation such as a swimming pool or

tennis courts. "We were looking for additional facilities and we find that the recreation authority can't do this," she said.

Representatives of the authority board countered that the idea of the authority was only to provide recreation programming.

McKeon said another reason in the city commission's change in heart was the dissolution clause that put funding of the authority on a year



Gas Station's Appearance

What does a person do who buys property in the country and builds a beautiful home on it, and suddenly the beauty of this area is destroyed?

This is what Mrs. June Lazarus of 49720 Joy Rd., Plymouth Township, is ask-

For the past six years the view from her house was one of fields and trees, the back part of her seven acres facing the attractive home of her neighbor. The neighbor, Mrs. Mary Budzynski of 9125 Kidge Kd. is worried too.

In recent weeks their view has been blocked by a pile of soil, approximately 15 feet high, that has been dumped on private property adjoining the two homes.

"This property is owned by persons who have the gasoline station at Ridge and Ann Arbor Roads," said Mrs. La-

Ford Just Another Guy In Early Days

First of all, you knew Rockefeller, Reagan and Milliken didn't have a chance to be vice president because President Nixon relies most heavily on lawyers and really considers a law degree a major qualification for high office.

Second, you could figure Nixon would shun someone who was intellectually adventurous - those who worry about population control, genetics and non-lawyer things like

So he came up with Gerald R. Ford, a football hero and attorney who in a generation of service in the U.S. House of Representatives has never sponsored a piece of landmark legislation.

Ford, now a healthy 60, comes across as old guard today, but there was a time he was the darling of the reformers' eye. I first heard about him in the early '50s at Boys State from some of the guys from Grand Rapids, and the next year in college.

He and the senior Paul Goebel and John Martin had whomped the McKay machine and were striving heroically to clean up Grand Rapids' politics.

There was talk in those years of pushing Ford for governor against G. Mennen Williams, but Ford said no because he was advancing well as a member of the House defense appropriations subcommittee.

As a young reporter, I covered Ford several times at political gatherings, and I can't remember a single thing he ever said. Gene McCarthy, the late Leroy Augenstein; Werner von Braun and Jimmy Hoffa were the most fascinating persons I've ever covered. Jerry Ford's answers to questions always sounded as if they were cranked out of a mimeograph machine.

Ford was super - cautious in those days. Ask him a question and he'd give you a two-sided analysis, so I made a game of asking him every question twice, the second



Will City's Get-Tough Policy Kill Unification?

While it has been Plymouth Township that dampened unification hopes in the past, it may well be that the city will become the spoiler of any current thinking along those lines.

Unification of the township and the city is the ultimate stage of cooperativeness and although the city has historically blamed the township for not cooperating, it now seems the city commission is trying to destroy what it had tried to build in the past.

The case in point is the of the authority. area-wide recreation authority, which the city commission has stalled and pussy footed around for six months

and now has abandoned. "For what reason?" you might well ask.

The unspoken answer is that the city commission apparently sees recreation as one of several clubs it can use to threaten the township into consolidation.

In his report recommending the city's withdrawal from the Plymouth - Canton has never really been officially created since the city commission has refused to sign the agreement the other three governmental units have approved), City Manager Fred Yockey cites several reasons why the city shouldn't join

All - except one - deal with matters that could have been (or still could be) changed if the city had taken a more positive and active role in the authority's forma-

The city approached the authority with a negative attitude -- and that spelled the authority's doom.

dumping piles of dirt near the service station.

Mrs. June Lazarus, 49720 Joy Rd., and Mrs. Mary Budzynski, charge that trash is also dumped on the site and then covered with the fill

"Sure we have to build up the land. A building can't be constructed on soft ground. We have to let the fill dirt settle before any building is done." Richardson said.

Hoffman said the State Police, who had been called by one of the neighbors, told him it was all right to bury a refrigerator and several other pieces of junk with the fill

"It's a lot better to bury an old refrigerator than take a chance some children might get trapped in it," Hoffman

The two men received a notice Sept. 17 from Donald C. Morgan, Plymouth Township attorney, saying that the landfill is "allegedly being used as a driveway, turn around and loading spot for railroad ties and a parking lot for commercial customers and employes."

This, the attorney said, is in violation of a township ordinance.

Edward Draugelis, attorney representing L&D Service, said that the former township building inspector "and until recently, James Briggs, the present inspector, had permitted the sale of firewood and railroad ties from the premises until your letter of Sept. 17."

Draugelis added, "It seems apparent that a near neighbor's complaint is the cause of this most recent action."

The attorney noted that the entire premises are zoned commercial and said:

"It is my hope that in Plymouth Township, chronic complainers will not be permitted to harass honest businessmen whose activities support rather than hinder the progress in this town-

Hoffman and Richardson, through their attorney, have filed a petition before the planning commission to seek permission to sell firewood and railroad ties, as had been suggested by Morgan.

They are also planning to submit an appropriate site plan for construction of a small paved parking lot to accommodate customers.

"It's hard to figure out," Hoffman said. "We have done everything possible to be good neighbors, have cleaned up the house behind our station and carried truck loads of trash off the proper-

"Why is it wrong for us to sell firewood on our commercial property when one of those complaining about us has been selling firewood in her residential area ever since we've been here?" Hoffman asked.

"We are doing exactly what our attorney advises us to do and hopefully will get this situation ironed out soon," Richardson said.

"It's rough enough trying to run a business these days without extra problems." Hoffman said that in the past they had given one of the neighbors some firewood

Spring Beauty Comes In Small Packages

By BETTY FRANKEL **Special Writer**

Spring beauty comes pre packaged in little brown bulbs, each of which contains a completely formed, embryonic flower. Plant them this fall and you are practically assured a glowing garden next spring.

Depending on the kinds of bulbs you plant, you can have flowers from late Feb-

ruary until early June. The earliest to bloom are small dainty charmers that grow from tiny little bulbs. There are at least a half dozen kinds that can be used to provide a preview of bigger things to come. None of them are what could be called dazzling, but many kinds soon multiply to form large spreading colonies that can be quite spectacular.

For the best display, at least a dozen bulbs of a single kind should be grouped together. An interesting Persian carpet effect is achieved if several varieties of little bulbs are planted inter-mixed in a random helter-skelter pattern.

One of the most delightful of the early bulbs is known as winter aconite, or eranthis, which is a Greek word meaning "flower of spring."

The knobby brown tubers produce buttercup yellow blooms nestled against a ruff of fringed green leaves on stems a few inches high. They bloom so early -- often late in February if planted on the sunny side of the house - that they are frequently blanketed by snow. cissus. Undaunted they keep on blooming.

Incidentally, there are always some gardeners who wonder about the relationship of daffedils and narcissus. It's just a matter of terminology. Some people call them all narcissus and others call them all daffodils. Some experts prefer to use the term daffodils for the large varieties with long trumpet blooms and call the small flowered kinds nar-

There are all sorts of variations in size and form. There are kinds with a single large flower per stalk and kinds with a cluster of small flowers at the top of each stalk. There are kinds that are known as long trumpet daffodils and kinds that are known as flat cups.

There are even little miniatures that copy the forms of the large kinds, but on a much reduced scale. The tall kinds can be over a foot in height. The miniatures are under six inches with flowers about an inch in diameter

Daffodils are especially loved for their cheerful sunny shades of yellow. Some of these are combined with touches of orange. There are gleaming trimmed with scarlet or bright yellow, and there are even a few new developments in delicate shades of pink or peach.

Among the favorites are King Alfred, a large trumpet golden yellow; Beersheba. which is white with an ivory trumpet; Duke of Windsor. unusually large white flower with flat apricot - orange



Scholar, Executive Came From A Farm

Dr. Wayne H. Buell, president of Lawrence Institute of Technology, is beginning his 10th year as head of the college. His association with LIT dates back to 1932.

Buell left the family farm in Lewis, Ind., to enroll in the first class of the newly opened college in Highland Park. He worked his way through college and was third vice president of the student council.

He received his bachelor of chemical engineering degree from LIT in 1936. In 1951, he obtained his master of science degree from Wayne State University, an alumni achievement award in 1952 and an honorary doctor of engineering degree from LIT

in 1958. Before entering the field of industry, Buell spent six Motor Co. during World War Michigan. years teaching chemistry II. and mathematics at LIT and

Industry Depends On LIT, Helps Its 3 Student Bodies

Lights burn until 11 at night in the classrooms of Lawrence Institute of Technology, the unusual urban college in a rural Southfield setting.

The Rouge River cuts a sylvan path across the 85-acre campus, and a crow cries only a few yards from a humming comput-

LIT, the second largest private college in the state, is healthy and growing on the 10 Mile - Northwestern triangle, a few miles south of where the hilly lake region of Oakland County begins.

With a 1973-74 operating budget of \$3 million and an anticipated enrollment of 4,000 students, LIT rests on a solid financial base. Careful management of resources and the use of facilities on a day-and-night basis enables the college to plan for a healthy fu-

Classes are in session every weekday from 8 a.m. to 11 p.m., and so the college operates in the black. LIT hasn't any debts other than long term financing of the \$2.5 million science building.

The college receives enthusiastic financial support of industry and alumni. Major corporations, recognizing the need for well trained personnel, make substantial contributions to LIT.

LIT ranks fifth among U.S. colleges as a supplier of management and technical personnel to two of three major auto companies. Employers give tuition assistance to more than 50 per cent of the students.

Students in day and evening classes study for degrees in five schools: engineering, architecture, arts and science, industrial management and the technical institute.

There are three distinct student bodies. The day college operates Monday through Friday. Evening classes are held Monday. Wednesday and Friday. Technical institute classes are scheduled Tuesday and Thursday evenings.

The same four-year bachelor of science programs available in day college are offered in evening college. Night classes are planned over six years and are attended by students who are employed during the day.

"LIT offers an unusual variety for students," says President Wayne Buell. "We are one of the few schools with a four year program in construction engineering. The program is supported by the Builders Exchange and construction management."

LIT is one of only three architectural colleges in Michigan. The college, accredited by the North Central Assn., offers four-year bachelor of science degree programs in mechanical, electrical and construction engineering, math, chemistry, physics, and industrial management with options of accounting, marketing and distribution, finance, human resources, manufacturing. computer science and industrial studies.

Associate degree programs are available in building construction, electrical and electronic technology, industrial supervision and mechanical, chemical and computer technology. A central core of liberal arts studies in the humanities and social sciences is included in all baccalaureate programs.

Federal government manpower experts anticipate the outlook for jobs in the field of engineering is best among all career occupations, says William C. Burke, director of student services and placement at LIT.

"Many potential engineering students have been unduly influenced by the depressing news of unemployment in the aerospace industry," he says.

"The Engineering Manpower Commission forecasts an average annual demand for 48,000 new engineers and a decline of bachelor's degrees in engineering to 31,000 in all U.S. colleges by 1975.'

Engineering graduates in 1972 received the highest starting salaries, says Burke, and the demand for electrical, mechanical and industrial engineers is growing rapidly.

"There are an unusually large number of engineering and architectural firms in the Detroit metropolitan area," says Buell, "and the demand is great."

Enrollment peaked to 4,566 in 1968 and 1969, says Buell, but he doesn't feel the draft had a more significant effect than other factors. About 1,000 veterans enrolled

Last year, 126 women attended LIT. Buell attributes the increase in female enrollment to the Equal Opportunity Act and the need to hire women in industry.


Tuition fees have increased about \$60 a year to the current \$1,020. The average tuition for private colleges is \$2,000, says

The college provides 60 scholarships and 400-500 students are on state tuition grants. Also available are loan programs, federal basic opportunity grants, and industrial scholarships. Employers of students pay a total of \$1 million in tuition fees.

"Alumni contributions have increased 10-fold in the past five years," says Buell. "We have alumni in responsible positions throughout the country. About 100 companies a year interview LIT seniors, and half of them have jobs before they gradu-

"The future of LIT is bright because of our location and program structure. It is unusual to have 2,000 students in a daytime program, 1,400 in the evening and 700 in the technical institute attending college at different times.

"This facilitates a high degree of space utilization and economy and enables us to reduce our tuition costs lower than any other private college. Available financial aids make it possible for students to choose LIT over public colleges."

The Style Conscious Male Puts It All Together

"If the shoe fits, wear it!" may still be an applicable and timely phrase in many situations, but not when it comes to the way a man dresses today, according to the Men's Fashion Association. With the stronger trend toward "pulling it all together" and leaving behind the haphazard, "anything goes" school, a man will have to use some judgment and discernment in choosing his

How a garment fits is, of course, as important as ever; but, in a season when the general cut of clothes is relatively stable, such things as fabric, color, texture -- and most of all -- how it is put together -- are very important

When buying his fall-winter wardrobe this year, a man will hear frequent reference to shetlands, saxonies, tweeds, flannels, camel hairs, corduroys, texturized polyesters, double-knits and warp knits. Here's what they're all about:

THE SHETLAND

A shetland is a tweed-like fabric woven from the wool of shetland sheep. They are softer and more luxurious than ordinary tweeds and a bit more perishable, too.

The original saxony cloth took its name from the German region in which it was woven. It was first woven from a blend of wool and worsted yarns and it is very adaptable to pattern-work such as plaids and checks.

Tweeds are woven of tough, coarse, woolen yarns and originated in Scotland and Ireland. They are made in many weaves and many patterns ranging from plain Donegals and herringbones to bold plaids and checks. Tweeds are very adaptable to color (their soft surface "nap" tends to blend bright shades) and they are used in suits, sport coats and topcoats.

Flannels in their simplest form are a plain twill weave of either fine spun wool or worsted and they are "finished" with a soft surface nap. Others may be in stripes, checks and plaids. Once thought of as a sporting or casual fabric, flannels are now worn for business and dressier occasions. Their most usual use is for suits, blazers and slacks.

CAMEL HAIR
Camel hair is, obviously, the wool of the camel and it is, most often found in plain weaves although sometimes in both twills and herringbones. The usual use of camel hair is in topcoats and sport coats, and, its usual color is one of the typical tans.

Corduroy was originally a cotton fabric but now it is made of man-made fibers, too. It is a plush cloth in which the ribs or cords are cut after weaving. French in origin, its name was "corde du roi," or "cord of

kings."
Texturized polyesters are man-made yarns with a built-in stretch factor. They can be either woven or knitted to simulate a number of wool and worsted fabrics; and they have become very popular because of their durability and the fact that they cost much less than the currently high priced natural fibers.

Double-knits, either of 100% polyester or of polyester blended with natural fibers, are produced on machines that actually knit two surfaces that are locked together in the knitting. They have recoverable stretch, almost total wrinkle resistance and are known for holding their press.

Warp knits and single-knits are less bulky than double-knits and (like double-knits) can either car-

ry self-knitted patterns or can be woven plain, then patterned with sublistatic prints that are similar to decals.

FALL COLORS
Fall colors this year are just that -- fall colors! They are the warm, earthy tones such as camel, tans, browns, darker greens, rusts, oatmeals with accents of deep yellow, burgundy and gray. There is a lush look about the colors and fabrics this fall -- none of the flat, smooth look of some years ago.


