Harrison Hoping For A Grid First

It will be Farmington against Harrison tomorrow (Saturday) in the final gridiron clash of '73 in Observerland.

It will be a battle to see who closes out the campaign with a winning record. Both clubs boast 4-4 marks with this game, played nine weeks late because of the teachers strike, the decider in who finishes a winner.

The Falcons and the Hawks are both nursing wounds from setbacks last weekend. Farmington fell

apart at the hands of North Farmington, 42-7, and Harrison tumbled before Plymouth Salem, 20-12.

"I expect this to be an offensive battle," commented Farmington Coach Hal Beardsley whose Falcons have been outscored, 180 to 129.

The Falcons have defeated Lutheran West, Waterford, Stevenson and Southfield and have fallen to West Bloomfield, Pontiac Northern, Walled Lake Central and North Farmington.

"We have come a long way this season with a very inexperienced team," added

the Farmington coach. "This was a green team with our offensive backfield all we had back."

"Kevin and Brian Ratliff and quarterback Bob Holton were all we had and this with an inexperienced line wasn't enough," he said.

Farmington and Harrison have met twice before on the gridiron with the Falcons holding a 2-0 edge. Farmington won the first game in '71, 21-12 and dashed to a 14-6 win last year.

Harrison Coach John Herring is hoping for a first this time. His Hawks have never beaten a rival Farmington school, losing to North three times and Farmington twice.

"We feel this is our best team even though we have

Area Girls Splash To 5 All-State Swim Crowns

East Lansing captured top honors in the second Michigan high school girls' swimming championships but Observerland teams were right behind.

Four area girls splashed to all-state acclaim and one was the meet's only double champion.

Lisa Akerman, a sophomore from Southfield Lathrup, was a double state champ with a 2:03.42 in the 200-yard freestyle and a 5:33.06 in the 500-yard freestyle.

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy, which finished third in team totals, sported two state champs in Jodi Yambor and Kathy Kolon.

Jodi won the 50-yard freestyle in :25.7 and Kathy the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:13 flat.

The Farmington school, defending state champ, finished with 137 points behind East Lansing (163) and Ann Arbor Pioneer (143).

Another area champion was Livonia Churchill's Carol Rusis with a 1:04.61 time in the 100-yard backstroke.

Carol broke the state record she established last year. She swam to a 1:04.65 in winning in '72 and topped it by three-tenths of a second this year. Carol also placed seventh in the 100-yard butterfly. Her teammate, Mary Reid, a sophomore, placed fourth in the 50-yard freestyle and eighth in the 100-yard freestyle, with Churchill placing ninth in the state in team standings.

Miss Yambor of Mercy, who won three all-state awards last year along with All-American acclaim, also

placed second in the 100-yard freestyle and the 200-yard medley relay.

Canton Eyes Police Dept.

Canton Township officials expect to make provisions in next year's budget for a police department.

Size of the allocation is still unclear and hinges on possibly paring down a sizable

fire department request for more money to add additional personnel.

But any move to establish a police department will be a modest one, stressed Supervisor Philip Dingeldey.

Budget details are still to be worked out, he told the Plymouth Mail and Observer and should be settled within two weeks. The budget will then be presented to the township board for review and approval.

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners will end funding of the Sheriff's Dept. Road Patrol, which provides police protection for the county's townships, after August 1974.

Plymouth Township has formed a committee to study the alternatives it could take to provide law enforcement for its residents.

Dingeldey said that at the outset of budget talks some weeks ago, he had hoped to allow \$100,000 for the establishment of a small police department. This amount would give county officials solid assurance the township is trying to solve its problem of providing police protection, he added.

However, now he's not sure how much the township will be able to earmark for the department because of a higher - than - expected budget request from the fire department.

Dingeldey said he hopes to sit down with Fire Chief Mel Paulson next week to see what can be worked out.

He also expects to meet with road patrol officials soon to discuss further the steps the township hopes to take to resolve its police protection problems.

Dingeldey explained that the recent controversy over the I-275 overpass on Joy Road has stalled budget deliberations, usually completed by now.

"We've been so busy taking care of that matter that we haven't had time to work on the budget," he said.

Dramatic finishes, the keenest competition of the season and another wild scoring night in the Wonderland Classic marked the activity on the Observerland bowling front during the past week.

Before making nominations for mayor, the new commissioners thrashed out their feelings on how the commission should function and what they thought of the mayor's role.

Then Bev McAninch nominated Joe Bida, John Moehle nominated Mrs. McAninch, and Bob Sincok nominated Norb Battermann.

The first ballot (representing secret paper voting) produced three votes for Battermann, two for Mrs. McAninch and two for Bida. Four votes were needed for a majority.

After the first vote was counted, the commissioners



again thrashed out their thoughts on the post and the three candidates spoke about their goals.

A second balloting produced the same split as the first and Mrs. McAninch asked Bida if he'd step aside.

He said he would; a third ballot was taken and produced four votes for the new woman mayor and three for Battermann.

The commissioners agreed to make the choice unanimous and the new commission, born in that "smoke-filled room," emerged for the public meeting.

Despite the many jokes about having a "petticoat mayor" told in the halls of city government and at the "gloom and doom society" (so aptly dubbed by my predecessor), the new commission and its mayor have

started off on the right foot — harmony.

We'll let Her Honor have the opportunity of running at least one commission meeting before we dwell in this column on the feminine turn in Plymouth politics.

But it's pleasing — and very heartening — to see how the new commission is beginning.

It looks like a good commission term ahead for the city.

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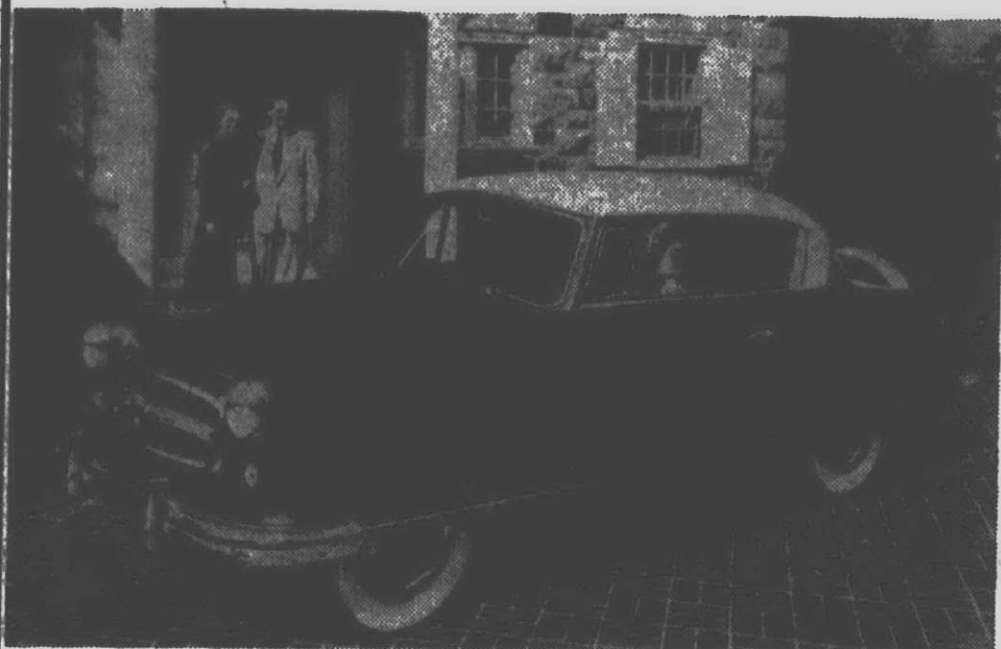
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Hines Park Rapist Aim Of Manhunt

A rapist who has attacked couples in Hines Park and struck again Monday night in Redford's Bell Creek Park, is the object of a search by three police agencies.

Livonia and Redford police, along with the Wayne County Sheriff Dept., are hunting the man who they believed assaulted five women in Hines Park.

Sgt. Vi Mote, of Redford police, said a 23-year-old woman and her companion were approached about 9 p.m. Monday by a man wearing a ski mask and carrying a handgun.

He tied up the man, and forced the woman to a secluded area where he allegedly attacked her. She was then led back to where her male companion was. The attacker tied her hands and warned the couple he would kill them if they tried to get free.

The description of the attacker and his method of operation matched that reported by Livonia police and the sheriff.

Livonia policewoman Ann Dempsey said she received a complaint last Friday from two juveniles who said they were approached in Hines Park near Levan by a man who carried a knife and gun, tied up the boy and assaulted the girl.

Mrs. Dempsey said the girl told her the man did not put on his ski mask until he had tied her up and was leaving the area. The youths gave police a description of his face, the only one available from any of the victims.

The man is described as white, between 30 and 35 years of age, five-foot-eight to five-foot-10 inches tall, clean shaven and having short hair.

Police say the suspect never gets rough and that he always leads his female victim back to where her companion is before tying her up.

Zephys Q, a four year old mare who appears to get better in each outing, had to come from way back to win last Saturday. The mare was pinned in along the rail and didn't seem to be able to get out.

Then driver Glen Quick found an opening at the three-quarter pole and that was all she needed. Zephys Q went after the leaders, moved ahead at the head of the short stretch and won by almost a length in 2:04.4. It was her 11th win in 32 starts

and gave her a record of 20 times in the money this year.

Michigan Mack, the speedy six year old owned Ralph and Joe Mapes of Hillsdale and driven by Ralph, demonstrated that it will have to be considered a contender for the big end of the \$10,000 finale in late December.

Mapes had his star in front from the start of the second heat, lost it momentarily the second time around and then rushed to the front to win by more than three lengths in 2:03.3.

Tonight's (Friday) Northville program is headed by a \$3,000 trot that includes all of the top performers on that gait. Missing this week and probably for another two weeks is Kool King, the three year old owned by Stewart Oldford of Plymouth. The colt injured a leg in a barn mishap.

Oil Shortage Stalls County Road Projects

PONTIAC Some 13 paving projects are likely to be delayed in Oakland County, perhaps until next spring, because of the petroleum shortage and a strike against a supplier.

RE-ENACTMENT OF MAINTENANCE OF COMMERCIAL PROPERTY ORDINANCE

Motion by Richardson, supported by Allen, to introduce and adopt Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. C-347-73

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF FARMINGTON CODE BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER, WHICH NEW CHAPTER SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS CHAPTER 41, TITLE V OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON. THIS CHAPTER SHALL BE ENTITLED MAINTENANCE OF COMMERCIAL PROPERTY.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

5.331. Purpose. It is the purpose of this chapter to protect the public health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of Farmington and to prevent, reduce or eliminate blight or potential blight in the City by the prevention or elimination of certain environmental causes of blight or blighting factors which exist or may in the future exist in, on or about commercial properties located in the City of Farmington. By the adoption of this chapter, the City of Farmington finds that such regulations are necessary to the public welfare.

5.332. Definitions. Commercial Properties shall mean any property in the City of Farmington zoned C-1 Local Business, C-2 Community Commercial, C-3 General Commercial or CBD-Central Business District.

Person means any natural person, partnership, firm, corporation or other legal entity.

Parking Lot means all areas set aside or designated for the parking of motor vehicles or the loading and unloading of motor vehicles on the premises or in conjunction with a commercial property, and includes all drive-ways, aisle ways or other areas supplementary thereto.

Proprietor shall mean every owner, lessee, tenant, or other person having the right to possession of all or a portion of a commercial property. Where there are more than one such person, all shall be jointly and severally obligated by the terms of this chapter.

5.333 Buildings. The exterior of all buildings located on any commercial properties shall be maintained so as to present a neat and orderly appearance. Windows shall be glazed, painted surfaces kept properly painted and all other appropriate measures taken to properly maintain the buildings. Where buildings located on commercial property are owned by separate entities, the obligations of this paragraph shall fall only upon those persons responsible for the particular building involved.

5.334 Parking Lots. All parking lots shall be provided with pavement having a permanent durable and dustless surface and shall be graded and drained so as to dispose of all surface water accumulated within the area. All cracks, pot holes or other breaks in the parking lot surface shall be filled and repaired promptly by the proprietor. The proprietor shall provide for the resurfacing of all parking lots at reasonable intervals. The proprietor shall provide for snow removal services, in order that the parking lot will be reasonably available for use by the public.

5.335 Trash Removal. Each commercial or business establishment will be allowed six 20-gallon containers or their equivalent per twice a week pickup. All refuse to be collected is to be in containers having the capacity of at least five (5) and up to twenty (20) gallons provided with handles, in rubbish bags designed specifically for that purpose, or items of a size approximately equal to that of a container. Waste receptacles are to be collected weekly.

5.336 Loose Trash, Rubbish or Debris. The proprietor shall be responsible for seeing to it that the premises, including the parking lot and specifically including that part of any highway, right-of-way adjoining the premises and not actually used for the travel of motor vehicles, are kept free of junk, trash, rubbish, debris or refuse of any kind. The proprietor shall see to it that the premises are cleaned of such debris or refuse at least each day and shall take all reasonable steps to provide containers for discards and to order his employees and encourage the public to use them.

5.337 Landscaping. The proprietor shall install and maintain landscaping on all areas of the commercial properties not occupied by buildings, sidewalks, parking lots, driveways and similar surfacing. The requirement of landscaping also is specifically applicable to those parts of highway rights-of-way adjoining the commercial properties and not actually used for travel purposes. Landscaping shall consist at the minimum, of the establishment of sod or other material to hold the earth and prevent dust and the establishment of noxious weeds. The proprietor shall maintain the landscaping and shall see that all lawns are mowed regularly, shrubs are appropriately trimmed and noxious weeds are eliminated.

5.338. Enforcement. This chapter shall be enforced by the Building Department. In the event of violation, the proprietor shall be notified in writing to remove or eliminate the violation within ten days after service of the notice upon him. Such notice may be served personally or by certified mail, return receipt requested. Additional time may be granted by the Building Department where bona fide efforts to remove or eliminate the violations are in progress. Such notice shall not be required in repeated cases of the same violation by the same proprietor.

5.339. Penalties. Violation of this chapter, including failure to comply with the notice of the Building Department within the time allowed, shall be a misdemeanor which shall be punishable upon conviction thereof by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 or by imprisonment not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

This ordinance was introduced and adopted at a regular meeting of the Farmington City Council on November 5, 1973, is declared to be an emergency ordinance which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and therefore will take immediate effect.

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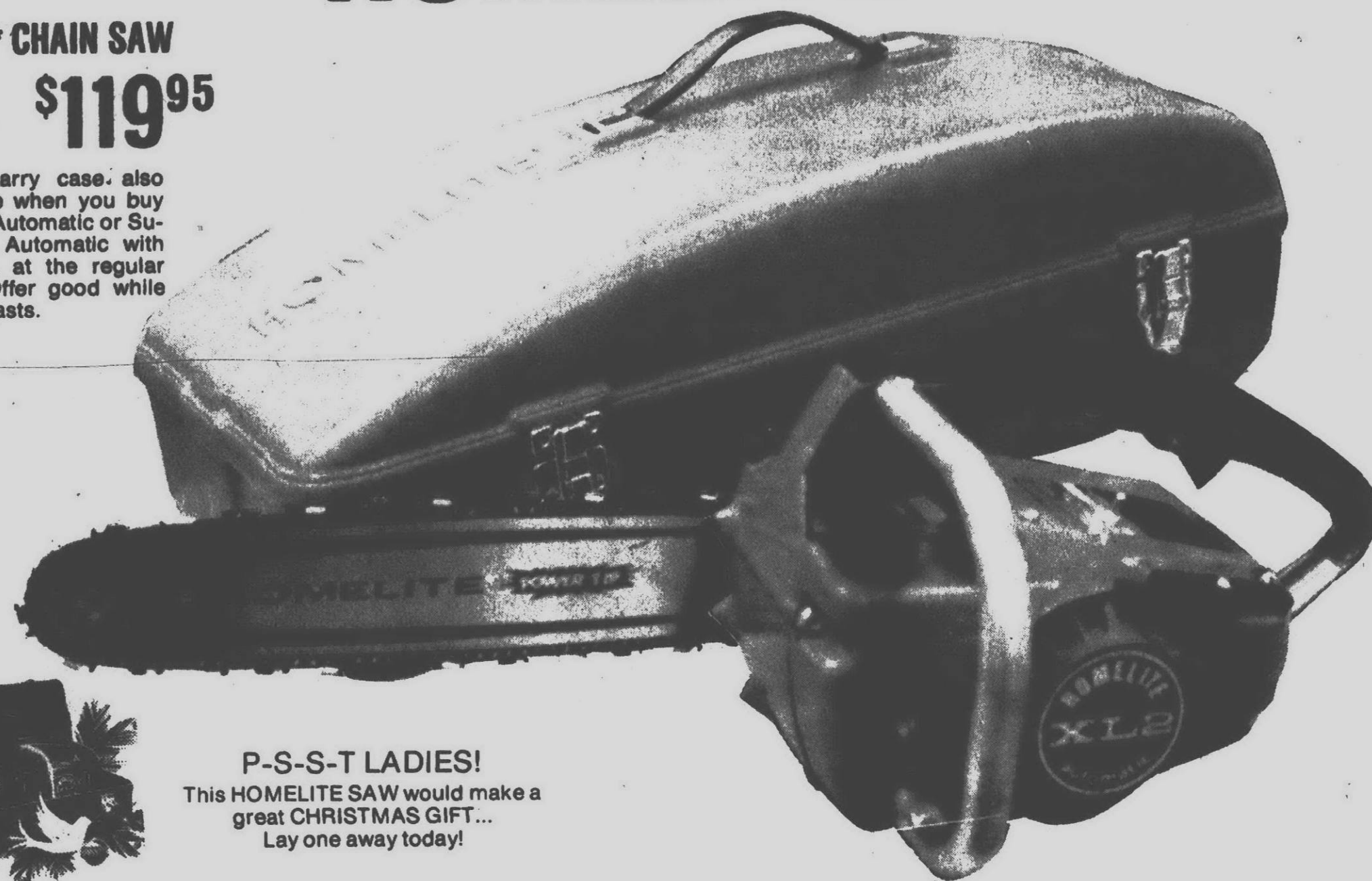

Water stones are a handsome addition to the home landscape and evidence of an interest in the current ecological - environment crisis, says Joe Cox, Michigan State University extension landscape architect.

Water stones are glacial boulders with the top hollowed out. Rain water collects there and supplies water to birds and other wildlife.

Many forms of wildlife learn to depend on the stones for their water needs, and it should be continuously supplied, except in winter when abundant snow serves the same purpose.

To prevent the buildup of algae in the free standing water, periodic cleaning is required.

Mosses, lichens and some native Michigan wildflowers will usually grow near the site of a water stone oasis.

"When moving natural glacial boulders, use nylon or fiber ropes and belts rather than iron chains," suggests Cox. "Abrasions and nicks on these stones will spoil the naturalness you are seeking."

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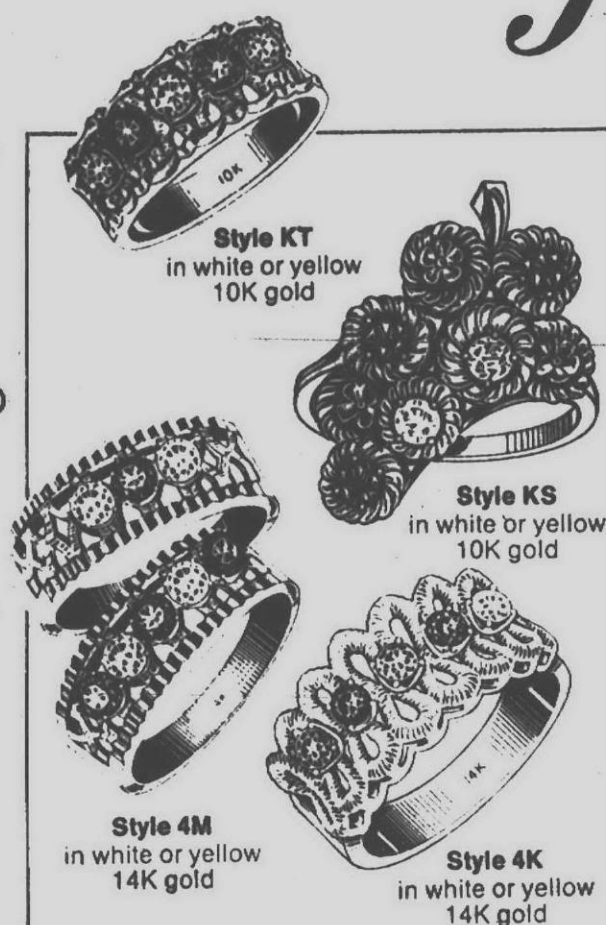
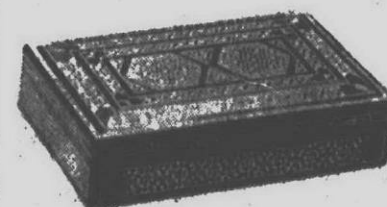

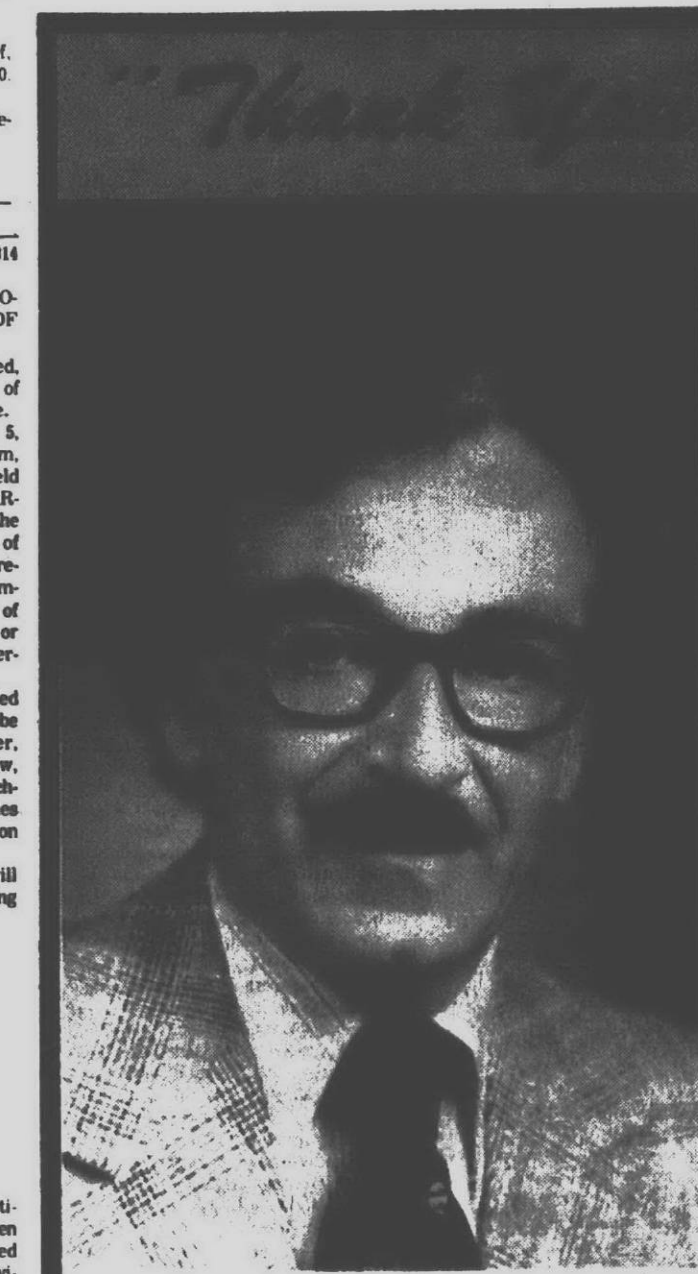

He will hear requests from area children daily. A contest will be held Dec. 22 for a giant eight-foot Christmas stocking filled with toys and games.

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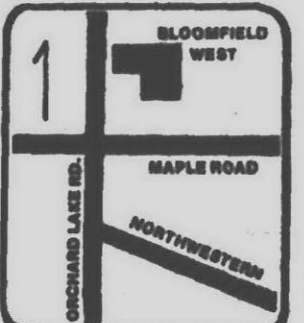

She explained that roller skating is very similar to ice skating, both stylistically and competitively. She emphatically states they are not "roller derby people."

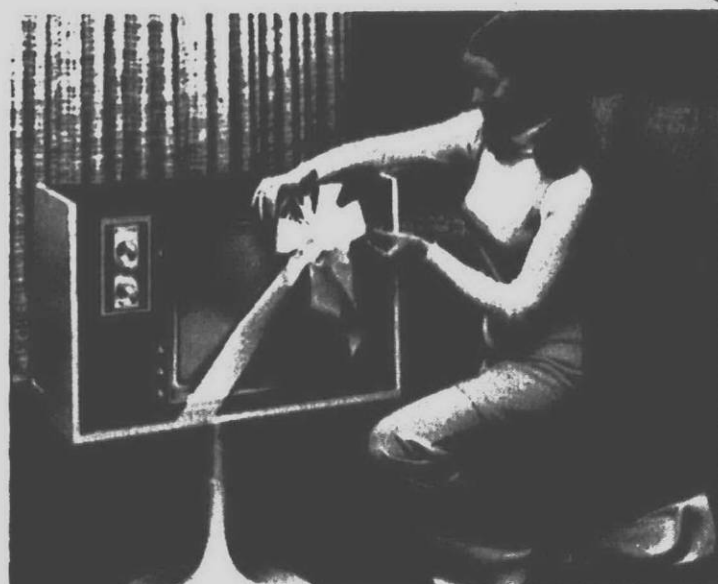

Among important improvements to look for as set features are:

- The super - bright picture tube. Chromacolor, which led the industry's long - term efforts to improve the color TV tube, provides a brilliant, high contrast, sharply detailed picture in 25-, 23-, 19- and 16-inch diagonal screen sizes.

- AFC (automatic fine-tuning) is a desirable control for viewer use. It locks in the TV channel and keeps it from drifting.

- ATG (automatic tint guard) regulates flesh tones

to overcome variations in TV station transmissions.

- Remote control. This lets you switch from one favorite program to others around the dial without moving from your chair.

Begin Music Lessons On The Right Note

What better home entertainment than your child playing a musical instrument?

Music educators agree that every child should be able to discover the fun of music. However, a youngster can only achieve his full musical potential by learning on an instrument that he enjoys and with a teacher suited to his needs.

Suggestions for helping your child develop his musical abilities are:

- Allow the child to select the instrument that he wants to learn. If he decides that he doesn't like it, even after he's started lessons, allow him to take up another one. Music should be an exciting, satisfying experience, not one that the youngster feels he is forced to pursue.

When your son or daughter has decided on an instrument, buy or rent a good one. An inadequate instrument — with improper sound — will only frustrate the child and discourage him from practicing. A good instrument reinforces learning by producing good tone when he plays correctly.

Most music stores will rent instruments on a trial basis (with an option to buy) while the youngster tests his interests and abilities.

In addition to a good instrument, the child should be learning with a good teacher. It is important to remember that a good musician is not necessarily a good teacher for the beginning child.

A teacher should be selected for his or her ability to relate to the youngster and make him comfortable in music studies.

When selecting a teacher, you may want to find one that offers group instruction rather than private lessons. For the beginning musician, group lessons offer the advantage of learning with and from peers, making music a social and fun activity rather than a chore, enlarging the child's circle of friends.

After the child has taken several lessons, ask him if he is enjoying his studies. If he says he doesn't like the teacher, or the instrument he is studying, let him switch instruments or teachers.

It is essential that you show interest in your child's

progress. Encourage him to practice, but do not make it a chore for him. Perhaps your child needs only 15 minutes at the beginning and end of the school day to learn his lessons, instead of an hour's practice each day.

Allow him to set his own practice time and encourage him when you feel that he's doing especially well. Music should be a part of the child's development but he should also have time to play with his friends and take part in sports and other recreational activities.

If practice sessions are not going well, it might be better if he did not practice for a while, going back to the instrument when he is more relaxed and the music comes easier.

If you play, why not join your child at his practice on occasion — making the learning process a shared family activity.

Always bear in mind that your child must be happy with his own progress and with his teacher. Only when he feels satisfied with what he is doing musically will he enjoy his music making.

BACK

GAMMON: The Game At The Top

At the top of the current list of games people are playing is backgammon.

The "other side of the checker board" is enjoying a popularity among the gamy set unmatched since Scrabble sent us all scurrying to the dictionary and Labyrinth increased the hand-eye coordination of the multitudes who indulged.

One need only scan Christmas brochures sent out by major department stores to realize that buying a backgammon set must certainly be at the top of somebody's Christmas list.

DOLLAR SETS with cardboard boards and plastic checkers for men are pictured alongside hundred dollar all-cork boards. In between are traveling sets, sets with magnetic men and sets in varied color combinations — whichever blends in with your game room, my dear.

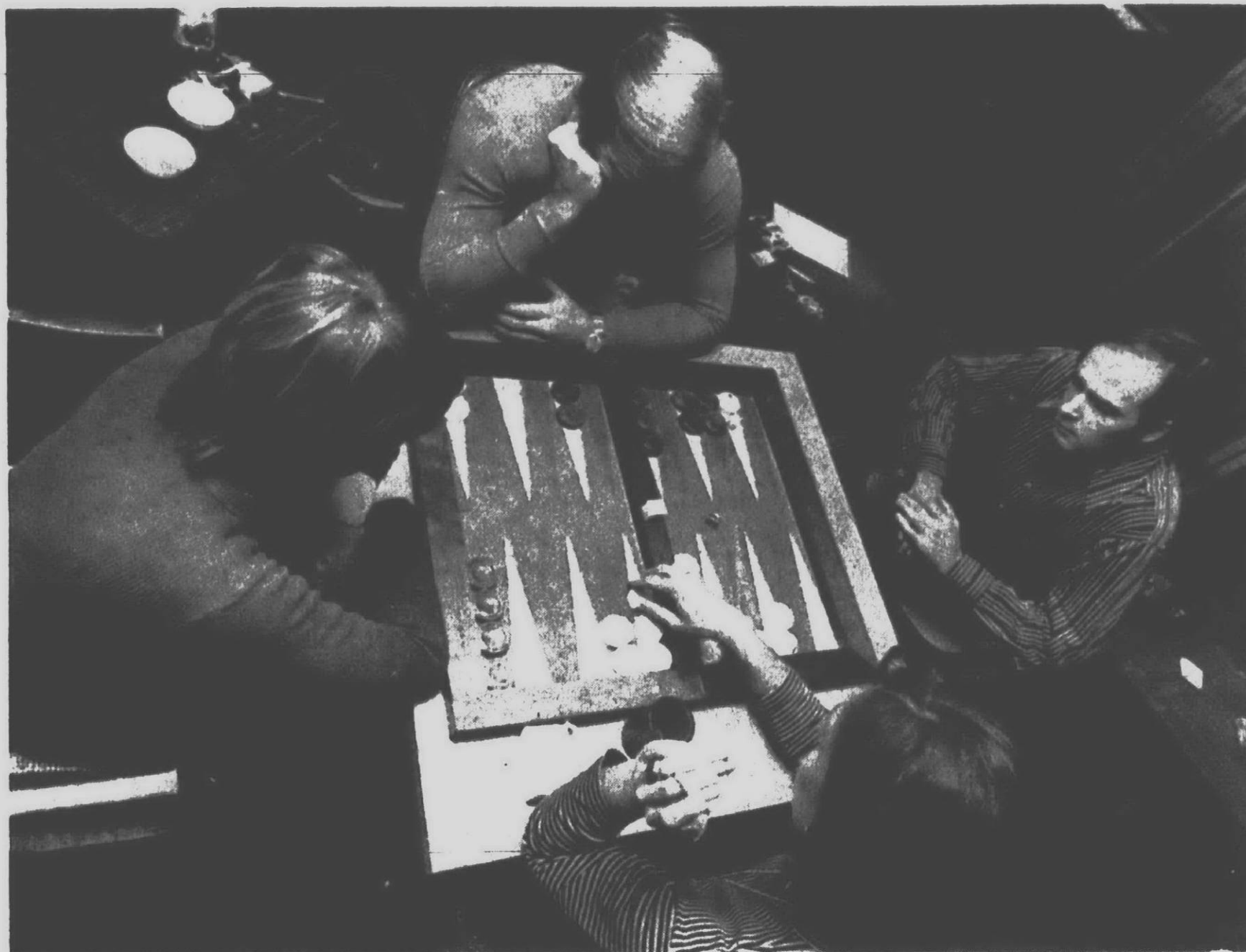
But topping the list of backgammon for Christmas ideas is the set shown in a spectacular catalogue. An elegant backgammon set is pictured enclosed in a colorfully printed case, and playing the game are a man and woman wearing matching blazers in the same colorful print. Its price — backgammon set complete with blazers — a mere \$470.

"Backgammon is flourishing," Howard Perlman, manager of Cavendish North — a Southfield-based backgammon and bridge club located at 29200 Southfield Road, understated. "It has caught on." And Howard and his wife Linda are only happy.

"We opened Cavendish North as a duplicate bridge club just over a year ago," Perlman, a professional bridge player, related. "And truthfully we ran into problems."

It seemed that there were already a number of established duplicate clubs in the Southfield area and players were reluctant to try a new arrival.

"There was just the inkling of the possibilities of

backgammon; we had a couple of boards and a few people played."

"WE BEGAN TEACHING both bridge and backgammon; and our teaching programs caught on. We were asked to handle backgammon clinics for J.L. Hudson and they were very successful. Then some of the country clubs asked us to give some classes.

"It turns out we are the only backgammon school in the Midwest."

Now primarily a backgammon club, Cavendish North has converted many bridge players.

"Both games have a tremendous intellectual attraction," Perlman stated. "But to be a good bridge player takes time, patience and a lot of practice. Backgammon can be learned — and played decently — in four lessons."

Perlman listed these assets for backgammon: It's a fast game — that attracts a lot of people. One game can be played in five to 10 minutes.

It's a flexible game — it can be played by as few as two or as many as five players.

It's a competitive game — you can play at home for your household allowance or at a club for prize money.

DOES THE SNOBBERY associated with duplicate bridge rub off on backgammon?

Perlman emphatically says "no" — and gives examples of more experienced players sitting down with club newcomers to give them a sense of the game.

"Most regular backgammon players feel personally involved with the club. They want it to succeed. They know that more members can only make it more fun."

Now part of the newly formed World Backgammon Association, Cavendish North recently held its first club tournament and by the first of the year hopes to be awarding master points — similar to bridge master points.

Backgammon is no new arrival, having just been conceived by a games man (or woman) at Parker Brothers or Mattel.

It is played throughout the world, sometimes under different names and variations. Game historians trace backgammon's oldest ancestor to 5,000 years ago in Mesopotamia (now Iraq).

A number of early versions were known in China, India, Greece, Rome and Egypt.

In Britain, it dates from Anglo-Saxon times, although its popularity grew during the Crusades. Called "tables," it spread from the upper classes through the medieval society in Europe.

HISTORIANS HAVE EVIDENCE that innkeepers used it to attract customers, providing them with boards, men and dice.

The Church, opposed to any and all gambling, attempted to outlaw the game. But by the end of the 15th century, many countries again permitted "tables" — though they were still forbidden to university students and apprentices learning their trades.

In the United States, backgammon has been played since the 17th century. Interest in the game peaked in the 1920s when "doubling" was invented — giving an opponent the opportunity to play for doubled stakes or to refuse — the game then ends at the original stakes. "Redoubling" followed shortly after.

WHETHER THE NEWEST backgammon revival will make the game a permanent part of the American games scene, or whether it will fade into oblivion remains a question.

According to Cavendish North manager Perlman, "it will never take the place of bridge, but it may make a nice companion to it."

He hopes to direct more people toward the game by holding ladies day luncheons and backgammon at the club on Mondays; by having couples' backgammon tournaments on Saturday nights; and by continuing the club's 1 p.m. to 1 a.m. hours for drop-in backgammon play.

The club offers a series of four group lessons as well as private lessons for interested persons.

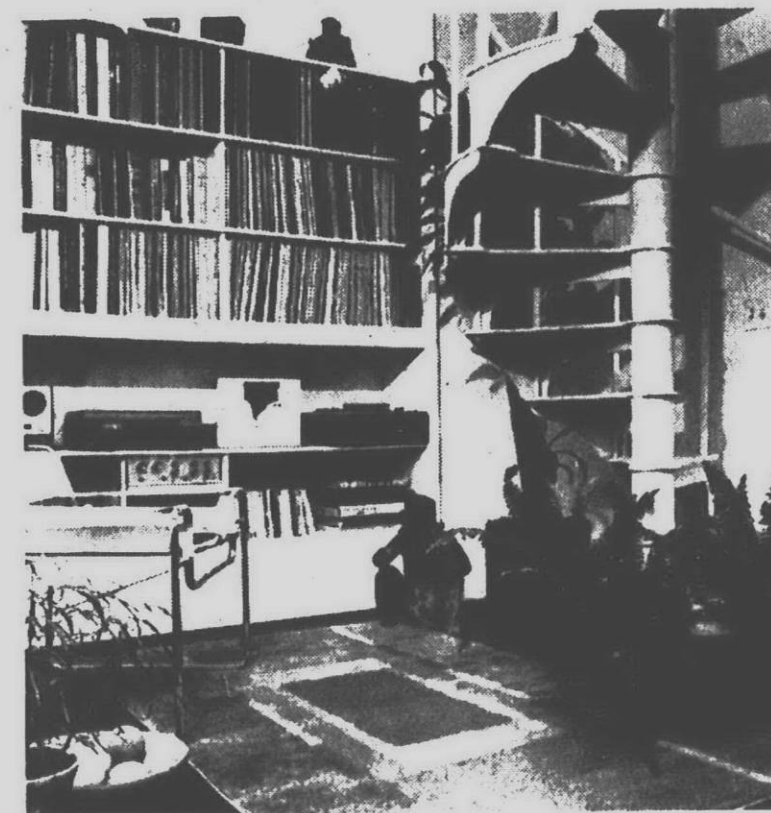

That first car you ever owned could be yours again, as one car from each of the four decades is auctioned off at the show.

Auctions are set for: 20's on Sunday evening, 30's on Monday evening, 40's on Wednesday evening, and 50's on Friday evening. Also on Friday evening a 1957 London Taxi and a 1974 Cougar Coupe will be auctioned.

New Cars Given Away

Five new cars will be given away as attendance prizes, one each weekday, Monday through Friday. Show goers need only fill

out and deposit their ticket stubs to be eligible to win. The new cars are: Monday, Mustang; Tuesday, Vega; Wednesday, Duster; Thursday, Gremlin; and Friday, Datsun 210.

Contests Spur Action and Involvement

"Community involvement and action are new thrusts for the Detroit Auto Show this year," said Boyce Tope, executive vice president of DADA, and perennial general manager of the show.

"And one way we're developing this is by involving groups and organizations in various contests."

One example, the Miss Detroit Auto Show contest will involve entries from each car division of the Big Four auto makers and each car company involved in the show.

Plans call for each to hold their own internal contest or search for their loveliest lady to represent them. The winner from each will be present at their respective exhibit areas and on stage the first Sunday afternoon, Nov. 18, when a panel of judges will select Miss Detroit Auto Show.

Another beauty contest, this one for the professional models working at the show, will also be held. Called Miss Deluxe Model, the winner will be announced the week of Nov. 12.

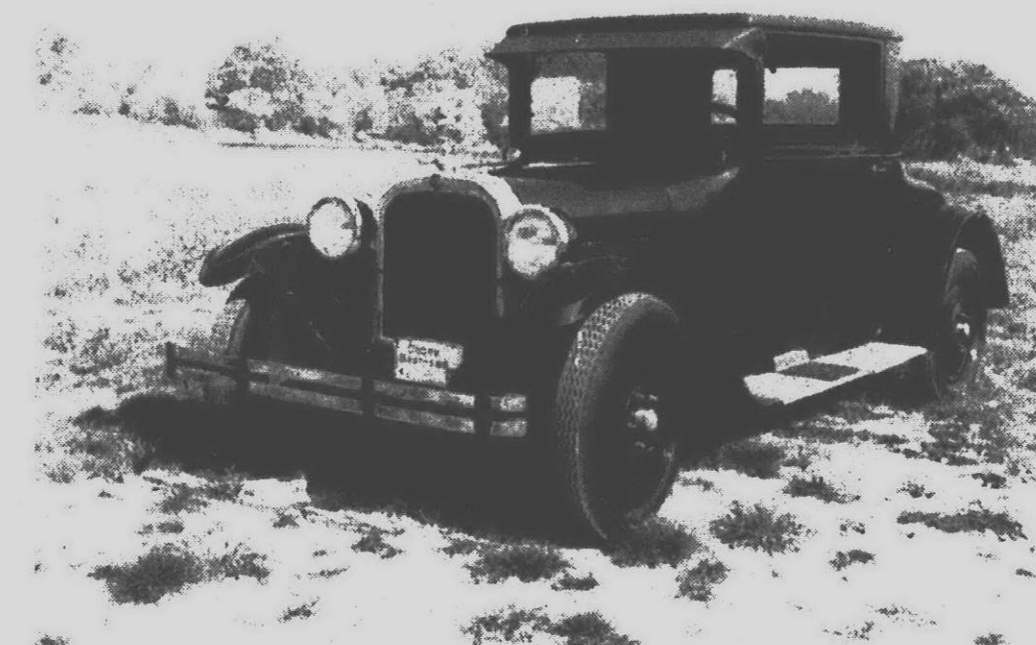

SHOW TO HONOR WALTER J. BEMB, INDUSTRY PIONEER

The ribbon-breaking ceremony at the 58th Detroit Show Nov. 17 will honor Walter J. Bemb, one of the foremost pioneers of the auto industry.

Bemb will ride in the car that breaks the ribbon to open the 1974 Auto Show which runs Nov. 17-25 at Cobo Hall.



WALTER BEMB,
Industry pioneer...

THE NOSTALGIC FLAVOR of this year's show should bring back plenty of fond memories for Bemb, who began his career 71 years ago as a mechanic for Detroit's first dealership — the William E. Metzger Co.

"I had to lie about my age to get the job," he recalls.

In 1906, he became branch manager of Ford Motor Company's first sales office in the Detroit area. He later established the Bemb-Robinson Co., Detroit's distributor for the Hudson and later for the Buick, Pontiac, and Rolls-Royce.

"Not only did our salesmen have to go out from door-to-door selling cars," remembers Bemb, "we often had to teach the customer how to drive after we made a sale."

At age 88, he still works daily as a manufacturer's representative in the Fisher Building.

BEMB ALSO CLEARLY remembers the early auto shows. He places credit for the beginning of the Detroit Show on William E. Metzger,

a dealer in bicycles and later an important figure in the development of the auto industry.

Metzger traveled to England in 1895 to attend the first automobile exhibit ever held. In 1899, he and Seneca G. Lewis organized a Tri-State Sportsman's and Automobile Association for the exhibition of sporting goods and automobiles. Metzger, then the only automobile dealer in Detroit, displayed two steam mobiles and two Waverly Electrics.

To demonstrate his products, Metzger devised sets of rollers equipped with dials to provide visual evidence of speed and power to his cars. Once every hour during the four days of the show, the steam and electric cars would alternate in spinning the rollers and agitating the dials to the wonder of the skeptical public.

By 1907, Detroit's automobile row had increased to 16 dealers who decided it was time to hold a show apart from the Tri-State Association. This was really the beginning of the Detroit Auto Dealers Association.

SPURRED ON by the tremendous success of their first show, the dealers formed the pattern for the present Detroit Auto Dealers Association and set out to convince a skeptical public that the auto was here to stay.

New managements came and went but the shows from 1910 on were largely of one pattern with the location constantly being changed.

Perhaps the most exciting location of all, according to Bemb, was the Billy Sunday Tabernacle in 1917. The evangelist had put up his Tabernacle for temporary use only and by Auto Show time the building creaked at every seam and joint. It had to be tarpapered inside and out and a heating plant installed. To further complicate matters, a heavy snow fell the week of the show.

Salesmen working at the show were frequently interrupted by overhead noises as the feeble roof gave way and buckets of snow and slush came sliding through. In spite of the handicaps, this was one of the most successful of all Detroit exhibits.

RV'S JOIN AUTO SHOW

The RV Industry began in the 1930's, with the production of the travel trailer.

Moderate growth continued through the 1960's. In 1969, the total sales of RV's soared to 514,000 units, with only 5% of those being motor homes. 1972 was a spectacular year for RV shipments. Growth by year-end totaled 34%; more than double the growth rate of 1971. Total output for 1972 was 736,100 units, compared to 549,400 in 1971. This increase of almost 187,000 units was the largest in the industry's history.

A MAJOR CAUSE of the unusually large growth was the high rate of increase in the shipment of motor homes (84%). These units represent the top of the RV line, with average retail prices of \$9,188.

In 1972, motor homes comprised 15.6% of the total RV shipments. This year, in spite of a number of negative

factors, motor homes continue to increase in popularity at an annual rate of 49% over 1972. The most popular model is the mini-motor-home, with a 77% increase over 1972. It is estimated that the entire RV industry will realize a 5% total growth factor, shipping over 750,000 units.

With the entry of Detroit automobile companies into the industry at the manufacturing level, a significant thing happened: the RV industry has become a mature, stable industry. There are presently over 650 manufacturers of RV's, and that number is sure to drop to a mere 100 within two years, simply because of this maturing process.

TO SERVE AND GUIDE this massive industry in Michigan is the Michigan Mobile Home and Recreational Vehicle Institute, located at 19045 Farmington

Road, in Livonia.

The Institute is made up of over 700 member companies including suppliers, manufacturers, dealers, special service companies, and campgrounds. Day after day, the Institute works with administrative and legislative heads in Lansing to tell the RV industry's story and present other pertinent data. The Institute also works closely with the national trade association in Washington, D.C., keeping its members and the public abreast of federal rules and regulations.

The Institute supplies a steady stream of information to the public and its members, as well as holding educational seminars for anyone interested in learning more about the RV industry. The Institute also sponsors the annual DETROIT CAMPER AND TRAVEL TRAILER SHOW, held at the Detroit Artillery Armory every February.
