

Area prep basketballers dip to .412 winning percentage

Observerland prep cage squads dipped to a .412 winning percentage this week as the 19 area squads slipped to an overall, 76-105 showing.

Livonia Bentley, Livonia Franklin, Garden City West and Plymouth Salem wound up as winners on Tuesday's basketball card with St. Agatha, Redford Union, Clarenceville, Farmington Harrison, Stevenson, Plymouth Canton and Southfield - Southfield Lathrup chalking up another notch in the loss column.

Two area schools are still in search of that No. 1 victory.

St. Agatha, now 0-9 fell to Ann Arbor St. Thomas, 9-47, and winless Plymouth Canton dropped its ninth game at the hands of Dearborn Ann Arbor, 55-38.

Suburban Eight com-

petition took a turn to the wild side with four clubs sporting 3-1 marks in action. Plymouth Salem and Livonia Bentley survived to find themselves in a tie for first with identical 4-1 marks while Dearborn and Allen Park slipped to 3-2 showings. Salem had a comeback victory over Dearborn, 59-50, while John Farrar's Bulldogs just did get by Redford Union, 47-46.

RU moved ahead in the early stages, 8-7, but Bentley took an 11-9 first quarter lead and 22-18 halftime advantage. It was 37-33 after three quarters as Bentley found an 11-point lead in the stanza vanish and an eight-point difference in the fourth sliced to 47-46 with 13 seconds and RU had the ball.

With five seconds remaining, RU missed on a scoring opportunity and Bentley's Dan Dinsmore was fouled on the rebound but missed on a one-and-one opportunity to let it stay at one point.

Bentley shot 39 per cent from the floor, 19 of 49, Randy Litke scoring 19. RU hit 17 of 50 for 34 per cent, Jack Helzer scoring 18 points. It was RU's eighth defeat in 10 outings, and Bentley's seventh victory overall against two setbacks.

Garden City West jumped to a 5-0 mark in the Tri-River race to keep pace with Riverside and set the stage for the West - Riverside showdown next Friday (Jan. 25).

West humbled Schafer, 78-38.

It was 15-11 after one quarter and 31-23 at the half. West then went to the boards and collected 16 of its 24 defensive grabs and outscored Schafer, 47-15, in the second half.

West hit 29 of 59 for a floor shooting percentage of 48 per cent and Schafer connected 13 of 54. Ken Kinsvater was high for the now 8-3 Tigers with a game high of 22 points.

The Blue Jays of Southfield were crushed by Birmingham Groves in a non-leaguer, 90-59. It was Southfield's seventh loss in nine contests as Groves jumped to a 26-12 first quarter score and was never headed. Greg Miller and Robin Richards popped in 18 and 16 points respectively for Southfield.

Bloomfield Andover handed Farmington Harrison its fourth straight defeat, 76-49.

Salem jars Dearborn, 59-50

A strong second half comeback gave Plymouth Salem one of its most valued road victories Tuesday with a 59-50 win over Dearborn. The Rocks ran their Suburban Eight record to 4-1 and their overall mark to 9-2.

Although sophomore Jim Ellinghausen led the Salem attack with 27 points, it was the balanced fourth quarter scoring of five men that finally subdued the pesky Pioneers and made the victory decisive.

This and results of three other Sub 8 games Tuesday

left Plymouth and Livonia Bentley tied for first place at 4-1, Dearborn, Allen Park and Edsel Ford all a length behind at 3-2, Belleville next at 2-3 followed by Redford Union 1-4 and Trenton 0-5.

RU will be at Plymouth tonight as Dearborn invades Bentley.

Dearborn, picked in some quarters to succeed Allen Park this year as Sub 8 champion, went at the Rocks with a bothersome full court press from start to finish.

The Pioneers also demonstrated that their ball con-

trol, sleight of hand, quick-passing game is one of the best in the area as they hustled to 13 - 12 and 26 - 22 leads after the first and second quarters.

The off-balance Rocks were guilty of 16 turnovers in the first half alone. Had it not been for point-a-minute Ellinghausen's eight buckets for 16 of the team's 22 points in that half the ultimate victory might have been out of sight.

Jim Vanderhull, son of the Dearborn coach, and Jim Tracz fired the Pioneer offense with 21 and 15 points for the night, but Plymouth's 19 - 11 third quarter edge put the Rocks in front 41 - 37 at the three-quarter pole.

Dearborn fought back to a 43 - 43 tie but with 5:23 remaining Bruce Johnson's free throw gave Salem a 44 - 43 edge and it was all Plymouth from then on, with

Johnson, Ellinghausen, Rick Neu, Dan Moore and Eric Agardy combining to outrun the Pioneers in the final eight minutes, 18 - 13.

Plymouth had a 45 - 33 edge in rebounds, thanks to second half hustle, and a general clear-cut advantage in overall statistics in what throughout was one of the season's most physical man-to-man encounters. Dearborn is far from out of it as a title contender.

In the preliminary game the Plymouth Jaycees eked out a 66 - 65 win to put their record at 9-1.

Schools, county taking safety measures

Later starting times coupled with some suggestions for parents may help ease the troublesome traffic conditions that have cropped up in the Plymouth School District since the enactment of daylight savings time.

Parents will be asked to play a major role in the safety campaign being launched on the recommendation of the district's safety committee. Approval came at the board's Jan. 15 meeting and coincides with the board's

decision to start elementary school classes a full half-hour later from the schedules established at the beginning of the school year.

The new schedule-in effect until Feb. 11-calls for elementary schools to begin classes at 9:15 a.m. As daylight begins earlier, the schedule is being shifted back to eliminate the confusion that has arisen since the later school time was put into effect, said Supt. John Hoban.

Action on a citizen-oriented safety campaign also

follows on the heels of a traffic accident in which two Tanger Elementary School students were injured while en route to school in the early morning darkness Friday.

On Monday morning some 25 parents of the Tanger area met in an informal question and answer session

about safety of their children on the way to school.

On the bright side of the safety committee's report was the announcement by committee chairman Mrs. Flossie Tonda that the accident apparently has hurried the erection of a schoolhouse shaped sign in the immediate vicinity of Tanger School on Five Mile Road, near Haggerty.

According to Mrs. Tonda, the sign will carry the wording: "School zone - 25 MPH." This will be activated only during time the students are crossing the busy thoroughfare.

Mrs. Tonda also added that the Wayne County Road Commission has requested the State Police to make an immediate traffic survey. If the traffic count is high enough, the speed limit will be permanently reduced, she said.

She also announced the following new safeguards affecting other parts of the school district:

• A stop-and-go signal will be installed at the Hartough and Sheldon Road crossing. It, too, will be activated only while the school is in session.

Consolidation vote April 2

Voters in the City of Plymouth and Plymouth Township will go to the polls April 2 to decide whether to consolidate their two governments.

That date has been tentatively set by the State Boundary Commission for an election requested by the 1970 petitions filed by Dr. Gary Hall.

If the issue passes in both units, a second election will be held May 7 to elect nine charter commissioners - five from the township and four from the city - who would be charged with writing a charter for the new city.

Their charter would have to be approved by the combined voters before the new city could officially be born.

Because of the time needed for candidates' filing and ballot preparation, charter commission candidates must file for election on March 19 - two weeks before the consolidation election.

To qualify for the ballot, commission hopefuls would need the signatures of 20 registered voters from their own local unit.

Officials from the two governments can run for the charter commission, but must resign their city or township job if elected to the charter-writing body.

Residents of the two units have never had an opportunity to decide the unification issue although township voters turned down an advisory question on consolidation by 61-39 per cent last September.

Should the consolidation issue fail April 2 in either the city and township or both, the drive started by the Hall petitions would end there. No election for charter commissioners would be held.

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If you want more mileage from your poinsettia, here are a few hints for lengthening their flowering time:

Keep the soil moist at all times. Feel the top of the soil. A safe rule is to give some water daily to prevent drying out. Never let the soil dry so much that the plant wilts. Avoid setting the pot in a pan of water since too much water around the base will cause suffocation, and the plant will die.

Poinsettias chill easily. Keep them away from doors where cold drafts can blow over them. Also, keep them away from heat ducts and cold air registers as this causes leaves to wilt and drop.

Best daytime temperature is around 72 degrees. Best

night temperature is around 65 degrees F. Hot sun will cause the "flowers" to fade and will shorten the life of the plant. Give it a bright window. A little direct sunlight each day won't do any harm.

After the plant has finished its show, you can set it on the back porch until May. At that time, cut it back to within four to six inches and set it outdoors. Keep it watered during the summer months. Give the plant a few turns every week or so, to break off any roots which have grown through the hole in the bottom of the pot.

If you don't, the plant will be shocked when you pull it up in the fall.

Cyclamen plants are unique with attractive heart-shaped leaves and flowers which resemble "shooting stars" or butterflies. The cyclamen prefers a cool location. Place it in a bright window close to the glass where temperatures are cooler than the room.

A little sun in midwinter will not be harmful, but too much may fade the flowers. Keep the cyclamen watered until after the blossoms have finished. If you forget to water yours, leaves will suddenly droop.

You can bring it back by placing the pot in a pan of water for 20 minutes or more. After the plant has finished, dry it off by putting

plant in cellar. It'll start up again in the fall.

The azalea likes a well lighted window, but NOT direct sun. Cool temperatures lengthen the life of this item. Grow in 70 degrees in day and around 60 to 65 degrees at night.

Christmas pepper and Jerusalem cherries need a constant supply of moisture at all times. Normal room temperatures are adequate, but keep them away from dry, hot drafts.

GREEN THUMB CLINIC: "We want to grow the scarlet runner bean on a fence. I heard that the seed is not edible. Is that true?"

No. While the scarlet runner is grown principally as an ornamental vine, the pods, resembling the lima in shape, are eaten in the green shell stage. The vigorous vines grow over six feet tall and have bright scarlet flowers.

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TIPS FOR PAINTERS

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1. Remove as many loose bristles from the brush as possible without damaging it. A good technique is to roll the bristle end of the brush gently between your palms.
2. Rewrap the bristles to protect their shape. The wrapped brush should be suspended in linseed oil for a minimum of 24 hours before using - longer if possible. This prevents the bristles from absorbing paint pigment, and makes them flexible.

3. Before using the brush, carefully remove the oil by working it out over the lip of the can. Then roll the brush handle between your palms, taking care to avoid splattering the oil on your clothes or walls.

4. To insure all oil is removed, wash the brush in thinner or turpentine. Work out most of the thinner. Before painting, allow the brush to dry thoroughly.

5. When you start painting, dip the brush in the paint and stroke it several times over a rough surface, such as raw wood.

Coach Jim Millen's Schoolcraft College swimming team upped its record to 4-0 by sinking Kellogg Community College, 75-28.

signal will also be erected in a few days, she said.

At the Hanford and Sheldon Roads crossing, a traffic count is now under way to determine the best safeguards for the area.

The Ann Arbor Trail Haggerty Road crossing will

have a full-phase traffic signal that will be installed in the spring.

Mrs. Tonda also had some suggestions for parents to follow to make school routes as safe as possible for youngsters.

"Every effort should be made to keep the sidewalks

clear of snow," she said. Many children are walking in the road because they are unable to use the sidewalks.

Parents in rural areas should form groups and see that the snow on the shoulders of the roads used by children is firmly packed

down. She further suggested that the paths be covered with straw to help guide the students to the bus stops.

She urged parents to either equip the children with flashlights or to trim the outer garments with reflectorized tape to make them more visible to drivers.

In line with this, Plymouth-Salem High School students in Mrs. Kris Darby's art class have devised a fluorescent snail patch that can be sewn on their apparel. The patch - which includes a large snail and two smaller ones - can be purchased at the high school for 10 cents per patch, Mrs. Tonda said.

She also asked parents to alert children to the ever-increasing danger from passing motorists who ignore the flashing red lights of school buses that indicate that passengers are either being loaded or unloaded.

"This violation is increasing every day," she commented.

She also advised parents to check on the behavior of their children while waiting to board school buses. She said she is receiving numerous complaints of teenagers "daring drivers to hit them." Many of the complaints came from the motorists, she added.

Must city change TV ordinance?

The Plymouth City Commission has learned that it must change its ban of pay television and its method of charging cable television if the city's cable television franchise is to be approved by the federal government.

City Attorney Charles Lowe said the Federal Com-

munications Commission (FCC) has ruled that local governments cannot ban pay television (as the city's cable television ordinance does) and the rate charged cable television companies cannot exceed three per cent of subscriptions (as the city's franchise does).

To study the issue, the commission has asked How-

ard Sharpley, president of Alden Cable Television, the city franchise holder, to speak at Monday's commission meeting.

In addition to the cable television discussion, the commission agenda includes a decision on the rezoning of several areas of the city and the renewal of a contract with the city's DPW workers.

Schools find \$10,000 surprise

Plymouth school board members made the final payments on architectural and construction services on phase one of Plymouth-Canton High School - and received a pleasant surprise in return.

The board approved a \$45,000 payment to the contractor, F. W. Fordon Co. and a \$1,000 payment to the architects Wakely, Kushner Associates and then learned

that the district was receiving a \$10,000 credit from a contingency fund for fixtures that was never used. "It's almost unheard of these days - getting money back. Usually it costs," commented one trustee.

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Move to establish out-county branch of court advances

A subcommittee of four county commissioners has been formed to develop plans for a Circuit Court branch in western Wayne County.

The subcommittee, chaired by Commissioner Richard E. Manning of Redford, was established for the Public Safety and Judiciary Committee of the County Board of Commissioners.

Its other members are George Hart of Dearborn; Edgar L. Harris, Taylor; and

Chester Wozniak, Hamtramck.

The subcommittee was appointed by Public Safety and Judiciary Committee Chairman Michael J. Reilly of Detroit in line with a resolution sponsored by Hart, Harris and Commissioner John Lesinski of Dearborn.

The resolution expressed growing sentiment among the county commissioners in favor of a Circuit Court branch to serve the increasing population of western Wayne County.

The subcommittee was directed to negotiate with the Circuit Court bench toward the objective of locating "at least some" of five additional circuit judges, due to take office Jan. 1, 1975, out-county.

"The western Wayne County population has grown ten-fold in recent decades and is expected to exceed Detroit's population...within a few years," the resolution states.

The Public Safety and Judiciary Committee turned down a stipulation contained in the resolution which would have barred additional expenditures for downtown Circuit Court facilities in the meantime. Committee members said the stipulation would unduly antagonize the court.

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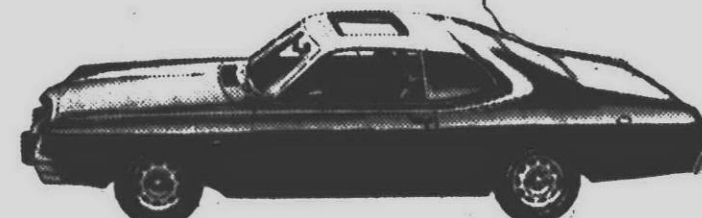
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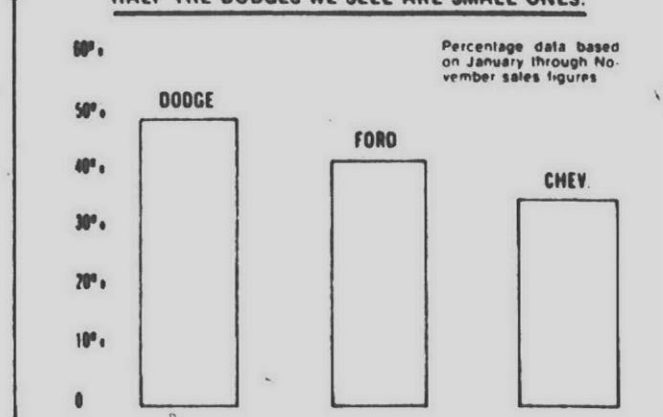
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Dirty Harry scores in 'Magnum Force'

But it's an effective way to introduce viewers to "Magnum Force," another Dirty Harry sequel starring Clint Eastwood and Hal Holbrook.

Eastwood is Harry Callahan, a sharp shooter lieutenant with the San Francisco police department. In this film, he's badgered by Lt. Briggs (Hal Holbrook) for using his gun too much. Consequently he has been moved from homicide to stake-outs. He makes the move back,

however, when top criminals in the city begin dropping off like flies — but not before he prevents a store robbery and single-handedly recovers a hijacked plane.

Back on the homicide squad, he gives his attention to the recurring murders of well-known criminals who have "legally" escaped the law.

Director Ted Post has effectively pieced the film together. It's fast moving and despite overworked scenes — seems every cops and robbers movie has a "French Connection" chase and "Godfather" bloody murders —

'Chariots of Gods' comes to screen

"Chariots of the Gods?" the motion picture adaptation of author Erich von Daniken's international best-seller, will open a limited engagement at the Penn Theater in Plymouth, Wednesday, Jan. 23.

"Chariots," a winner at the 1973 Atlanta film festival, explores von Daniken's controversial theory that many ancient civilizations developed as the result of advanced knowledge brought to the earth by extra-terrestrial visitors.

An international cult has developed as a result of von Daniken's theories, which have rocked conventional theories of archeology and history. Three of his books, all dealing with the subject, have sold over 25 million copies.

The Sun International Productions release documents the theory with examples from countries around the world, including such archeological enigmas as the

statues on Easter Island, the pyramids, and cave drawings resembling modern-day astronauts.

Besides such physical evidence, von Daniken cites Biblical passages and other ancient writings to support his theory.

The book and film have produced great curiosity and interest around the world. A number of noted scientists, including Dr. Herman Oberth, father of the rocket, have substantiated part of von Daniken's ideas.

While many established archeologists tend to ridicule von Daniken, the iconoclastic author predicts that resistance in the scientific community will lessen as new knowledge is developed about the history of man -- and the sources of his knowledge.

"Chariots of the Gods?" was produced by a German film company, Terra Filmkunst, and directed by Dr. Harald Reinl.

Ali, Frazier fight for TV

Olympia Stadium management announced the completion of arrangements for the live, closed circuit telecasting of the Muhammad Ali-Joe Frazier 12-round fight from New York's Madison Square Gardens, Jan. 28,

to five Michigan locations and the Windsor Arena.

There will be no home-television or radio coverage of the battle. In Detroit, the fight will be shown exclusively at Olympia Stadium and the Fox Theater.

"There's not much humor in music," says Plymouth Symphony Musical Director Wayne Dunlap, who nevertheless has found enough to fill an entire program.

"There's no humor to speak of in the 19th century, so most of the works are from the 18th and 20th centuries."

Humor will be the theme of the Plymouth Symphony's annual family concert Sunday, Jan. 27, at 4 p.m. in Plymouth's Salem High School, Joy Road west of Canton Center.

The overture to Rossini's "The Barber of Seville" has rollicking crescendos, Dunlap said. The andante (slow) movement earned Haydn's symphony No. 94 the subtitle of "Surprise" because it is interrupted by occasional loud chords that startled groggy noblemen.

Perhaps the funniest will be the presto movement from Mozart's "A Musical Joke." Says Dunlap: "Mozart always wanted to write a book on composition, but he never had time because he was always too busy composing. So he wrote this as an example of what NOT to do."

"There are phrases repeated once too often, wrong notes and an imitation of a group of village musicians. And it's full of sheer good animal spirits, charm and gaiety."

By tradition, the soloist for the family concert is young. Cellist Sarah Roth, a University of Michigan freshman, will perform the final two movements of Haydn's D major cello concerto.

"In the last movement, Haydn slipped in an English ditty called 'Here We Go Gathering Nuts in May,'" Dunlap explained.

Ibert's "Divertissement" opens with a strain from Mendelssohn's "Wedding March" that is interrupted by orchestral horse laughs -- "as if the composer is laughing at marriage. The finale has police whistles and all sorts of unexpected instruments."

Walton's "Facade Suite" was written to accompany Dame Edith Sitwell's symbolist poetry, which contains more color and rhythm than common sense.

Richard Strauss' nose-twisting "Till Eulenspiegel's Merry Pranks" tells musically of a sprite who rides a horse through a marketplace, poses as a preacher and mocks teachers, doctors and high officials. After his execution, his soul (the high E-flat clarinet) ascends to Heaven.

Tickets at \$2 for adults and

\$1 for college students are available in advance at Melody House and Heide's Flowers, both in downtown Plymouth, or at the door.

K-12 students are admitted free, but those below sixth grade must be accompanied by an adult. Babysitting by qualified girl scouts will be available.

Bus rides from the Tonquish Creek Manor senior citizens home will begin 45 minutes before concert time.

In the 12 months since the Supreme Court decision in question, more than 1.3 million abortions have taken place in the United States.

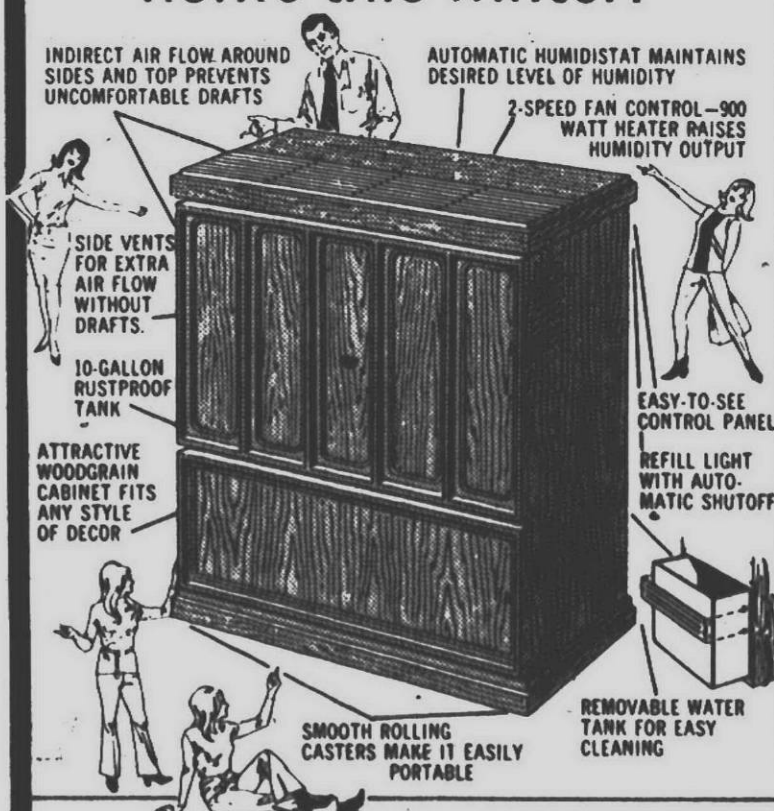

Supplies blueprints for success

"Let's see," says Southfielder Bob Fuehrer, "what were some of the goals I set for myself today?"

He reaches in his shirt pocket, pulls out a stack of file cards and gives them a quick, intent look.

Those who register for his Southfield community schools' class, "Blueprint for Success," may soon be doing likewise. The class starts Wednesday, Jan. 23, 7:30 - 9:30 p.m.

Although it is listed in the business section of the class brochure, Fuehrer says it's for teens through adult, men and women, husbands and wives, even whole families - anybody wishing for greater success.

And the blueprint? Well, that starts with a breakdown of stereotyped attitudes and replacing them with creative thinking aimed toward developing the leadership potential which everyone has. There will be some practice in goal setting and an examination of motivating factors other than fear or money.

Fuehrer is a real stickler for writing down goals - today's, tomorrow's, next year's - and he wants them handy as a constant reminder, just like a road map.

He says, "Regardless of educational level, every human being has an enormous amount of untapped potential. I think it's said that about three per cent of the population is using most of their potential. Most of us never realize or utilize our real ability. Think of all the people who have died and all those unused brain cells. They tell us we're wasting our natural resources. What about human resources?"

He speaks about the class.

"We're going to be talking about attitude and how a person can change his habits. Attitudes are habits of thought. The whole idea is trying to change our habits and break through the success barrier."

Attitude changes, he feels, come through better listening, increased awareness, improved communication and goals that are specific, realistic and attainable.

"You can't motivate anybody. It has to come from within."

Fuehrer, a graduate of Kent State University, ex-newspaper man, and public relations executive, is the local distributor for Leadership Motivation Institute.

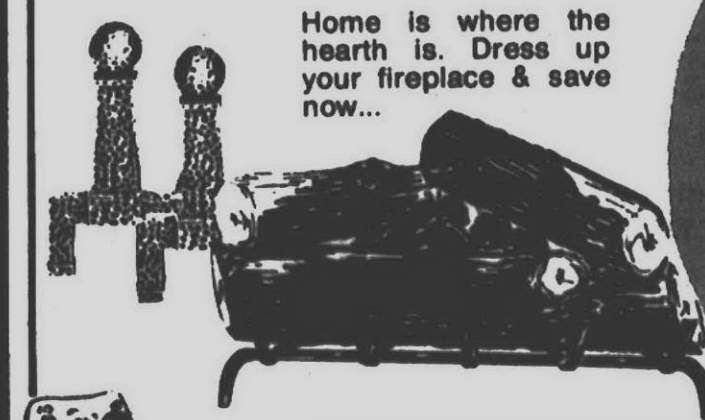

Ward missionary conference set Jan. 23 to 27

The World Wide Witness missionary conference sponsored annually by Ward United Presbyterian Church, Farmington Road and Six Mile, Livonia, will bring two missionaries for a series of meetings Jan. 23 to 27.

Participating will be Dr. Arthur F. Glasser, dean and associate professor of missions in the Fuller Theological Seminary at Pasadena and Sue Oiler, affiliated with the Oriental Missionary Society, with headquarters at Greenwood, Ind.

The sessions will begin at 7 p.m. Wednesday when both speak in evening Christian education classes.

There will be visits to several homes for informal discussion programs on Thursday, Jan. 24, and an All-Nations Banquet for families is scheduled Friday, Jan. 25, at 6:30 p.m.

Miss Oiler will conduct a missionary rally for children from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 26. She will do a ventriloquist act and a lunch will be served.

Saturday's schedule also will include an informal rap session with Dr. Glasser at 7:30 p.m. The session will be sponsored by the church's Pathfinders Class and youth groups.

The conference will end Sunday with mission talks in all Bible school classes and Dr. Glasser preaching during services at 9:30 and 11 a.m. and at 7 p.m.

A drive to civilize all military chaplains seems evident in official reports of the American Civil Liberties Union, the United Church of Christ, and the United Presbyterian Church.

For the chaplaincy has been a prime target of those clergy critical of U.S. participation in the Vietnamese War. Military chaplains have been identified, rather unfairly, as being the worst among their number, rather than the best.

Hence they have all been characterized as blessers of bombings and body counts who are isolated from the enlisted men by virtue of their officer's rank — a rank which is, in turn, dependent upon how willingly they allow themselves to be manipulated by commanding officers all the way to the White House.

This general caricature has been effectively challenged by U.S. Navy chaplain R.G. Hutcheson — effectively, because he does not deny that occasionally there are such chaplains.

He notes, however, that there are just such clergy, and similar, if not identical pressures, in the civilian parochial ministry.

Writing in Christian Century magazine, Chaplain Hutcheson cites a letter sent to all Air Force chaplains by the Clergy and Laity Concerned About Vietnam. This letter, he notes, was "widely interpreted as urging chaplains to council airmen to disobey orders," and may have been an attempt to "get at" the military by "manipulating their chaplains."

Despite his civilian status, Fr. McCormick did not take to his pulpit to denounce the widely publicized (and severely deplored) "silencing" of a Catholic cadet named James Pelosi.

While he counseled with Cadet (now 2nd Lt.) Pelosi during his long ordeal of isolation, Fr. McCormick did not denounce this ancient punishment from his (civilian) pulpit.

He goes on to note that the issue is not whether the military should or should not exist, but how churches and synagogues can most effectively minister to the millions who comprise it. He brands as "startling naivete" the idea that the military would allow "persons whose selection it has no part in and over whose conduct it has no control" to minister in the areas where chaplains are most needed — such as combat.

Chaplain Hutcheson asks this key question later in his article: "West Point has a civilian chaplaincy. What are its characteristics?"

Yet the Rev. James Ford, chaplain of the United States Military Academy, told this column: "I'm really not a civilian chaplain, because I'm paid and housed by the military."

No such pay allowances accrue, however, to West Point's Catholic Chaplain. For the Rev. Robert McCormick is pastor of the Church of the Most Holy Trinity by appointment of the Archbishop of New York, rather than the President of the United States.

Perhaps as Chaplain Hutcheson puts it: "The military needs prophets pronouncing judgment from the outside and also pastors sharing the life of the institution."

When you're part of an organization you can be more effective by working within the organization," he said. "Of course this is difficult in an iconoclastic society."

Said Chaplain Ford: "I was an area campaign manager for Hubert Humphrey when I was a Lutheran pastor back in Ivanhoe, Minn. But since I felt an obligation to try to relate to all my parishioners, I preached goals and left the specific methods to the political campaigning."

How much these two chaplains had to do with the Corps of Cadets' recent vote to abolish the silencing system, neither of the two will detail. But it is doubtful indeed that this reform would have been aided by a frontal attack from the pulpit by either chaplain — or by a silent press outside of the Academy.

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Rev. Roy Pranschke honored

Members and friends of Hosanna - Tabor Lutheran Church of Redford Township recently joined in a service of thanksgiving to honor the Rev. Pranschke's 25 years in the ministry and as pastor of Hosanna - Tabor.

The surprise anniversary service was planned by Rev. Pranschke's associate, the Rev. Bernhard Kube, and officers of the congregation and its organizations.

Speaker for the occasion was the Rev. Richard Schlecht, president of the Michigan district of the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod. The Rev. E.M. Hadwiger, former assistant to Pastor Pranschke, was liturgist. There was special music by both the adult and children's choirs.

Following the morning service, there was a congregational potluck dinner and informal program with the Rev. Walter Rutkowski, pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Farmington.

Edwin Ott, congregation chairman, presented a check to the pastor.

Rev. Pranschke organized the Hosanna Lutheran Church as a mission congregation in 1949, the year after he graduated from Concordia seminary in Springfield, Ill. In 1955 the congregation merged with the inner-city congregation of Tabor Lutheran Church.

"Not only have I seen God's Kingdom flourish in this Hosanna - Tabor congregation," the pastor said, "but also I have seen it in the whole Plymouth - Inkster area where so many churches have grown along with our Lutheran church during 25 years."

Pastor Pranschke and his wife, Hildegard, have lived in Redford Township throughout their 25 years of married life. They have four sons and a daughter.

School issue is deserving

EDITOR:

On Feb. 11, citizens in the Wayne - Westland School District will vote on the millage renewal proposal.

The proposed renewal of eight mills (\$8 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) will allow the district to continue the programs and services which are now in effect.
