\$ woes haunt  
Youth Inc.

PLYMOUTH — Youth, Inc. may have to close its doors if someone doesn't come through - very soon - with an \$8,000 appropriation.

That was the dire prediction of Dale Stermer, president of 14 - member board governing the youth facility located in the former home of the Plymouth Mail and Observer at 271 S. Main St.

Right now, we have less

than \$400 in the bank," Stermer said.

Utility bills are up to date, he continued, "but we're three months behind in the salary of the program director, Dale Yagiela."

He explained that the facility has been operating on an annual budget of \$25,000, one-third of which the city contributes. Additional funds

PCDC 'sells'  
area to realtors

PLYMOUTH - Nearly 100 realtors, developers and commercial and industrial leasers got a look at what the Plymouth Community has to offer Wednesday.

They were guests of the Plymouth Canton Development Commission (PCDC) which launched its push to attract industrial and commercial development to Plymouth and Plymouth and Canton townships with a breakfast meeting.

James Houk, executive director of the PCDC, explained to the realtors that the greater Plymouth Community has to offer in the way of services necessary for industry and commerce.

In his presentation, Houk stressed the convenience of transportation - rail, highway and air - to the area.

In addition to the rail transportation in four directions available in Plymouth, the C&O also owns several pieces of property in the area which are available for development, Houk said.

With the completion of I - 275 and M - 14 expressways through the community, Houk said, highway transportation will become more accessible to the area.

Houk also stressed the convenience of air transportation through Mettetal Airport in Canton Township, and Metropolitan and Willow Run airports which are near the area.

"We're offering our (PCDC) help to all these companies to attract industrial - commercial development," Houk said.

In addition to the realty companies' representatives, state and county development experts and several local governmental officials attended the meeting.

## Oldest veteran dies

PLYMOUTH — The neighborhood kids all called him "grandpa." He loved them in return.

He sat up all night, one time, at the hospital bedside of a six - year - old who had had an appendectomy, making her comfortable and easing her fears.

He invariably showed up at the home of a newborn baby, carrying a gift in his hand. Once it was a half dozen diapers.

That's the way oldtime

neighbors remember Walter B. Gribble Sr., Plymouth's last Spanish - American War veteran who died late last month at the age of 92.

Gribble wasn't one to talk much about his wartime experiences, except to comment on how different wars are now from then.

He served as a scout with the armed forces, sometimes days in advance of the troops following him. He engaged in hand - to - hand combat, too.

Actually, Gribble did his fighting in the Philippines. He was aboard ship headed for Cuba when the conflict there ended and the vessel was diverted to carry its soldiers to the island insurrection.

He got great satisfaction out of having served his country.

He was "proud as a peacock" when invited to be grand marshal of Plymouth's Memorial Day parade a few years back, according to Mrs. Bob Smith, a former neighbor in Green Meadow subdivision.

"He rode in the parade, but I'm sure he'd have walked if they wanted him to," she laughed.



come from the Plymouth Community Fund and from the sale of honorary memberships.

Disappointingly enough, he said, renewals of these memberships ranging from \$10 to \$50 (with an occasional \$500 have not been coming in as strong as they should.

Despite the gloomy financial picture, Stermer was optimistic about the facility's future if an \$8,000 appropriation is approved by the city commission.

Both Stermer and Yagiela feel that the organization is at a crucial point in time. "If we can make it through another year, we'll make it beyond that," Stermer believes.

He based his prediction on a strong new board of directors and "some plans that we've never had before." He added that he and Youth, Inc. treasurer, Jack Bologna, are now working up a presentation they will make before the city commission outlining new ways to make the youth facility more self-sufficient.

Yagiela said students who

use the center daily "are doing what they can" to help ease the financial crisis.

A candy sale is slated to begin soon and there are plans for a film series featuring cartoons and some "oldies" with comic strip hero "Flash Gordon" and comedian W.C. Fields.

Youth, Inc. officials are also hoping that besides a contribution, the Plymouth Community Fund will see its way clear in possibly "adopting" the youth center with agency status in much the same way scout organizations are.

But one thing is sure, without immediate community support, Youth, Inc. can't survive, agree Stermer and Yagiela.

He was made a lifetime member of Plymouth's VFW post and enjoyed going to its meetings on visits back here even after taking up residence at the Soldier's Home in Washington, D. C., after his wife's death about 12 years ago.

He planned his own funeral, too, and wanted a military one.

"His one wish was to be brought back to Plymouth and to have a military funeral," said Mrs. Stanley Kava, another former Green Meadow neighbor now living in Livonia.

"He wanted the VFW to conduct the service, with a firing squad, color guard, 'taps' and all," Mrs. Smith said. "He didn't want a minister; he wanted the VFW chaplain."

That's the kind of a funeral he had with Chaplain Jim McKindies delivering the eulogy.

Gribble spent most of his working life in Indiana with

the Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad. He came to Plymouth on retirement in 1953.

"He was like one of the family," Mrs. Kava said. "He was 'grandpa' to everybody."

His final visit to Plymouth was last Christmas when he came to be with his son and daughter - in - law, Mr. and Mrs. Walter B. Gribble Jr., and two grandchildren.

"His memory was still sharp and his mind as clear as a whip," Mrs. Kava said.

"He had long talks with the kids reminding them of things they used to do when they were small."

The weather was bad and word of the old veteran's death in faroff Washington was slow in reaching his Plymouth friends.

Only eight mourners were there when "taps" sounded at his Riverside Cemetery graveside.

"It was kind of sad," said Mrs. Smith.

### How to propagate plants by cutting

Cuttings are leaves, stems, or roots cut from the stock plant. There are two types of cuttings, tip and cane; and three types of leaf cuttings, whole leaf, leaf sections and leaf - bud, say Michigan State University horticulturists.

Propagation by cuttings produces a great many plants from one plant. Tip cuttings are suitable for propagating coleus, schefflera, geranium, fuschia, Christmas cactus, poinsettia, philodendron, and other similar types. Tip cuttings are cut just below a leaf and should be three to five inches long. The more leaves left on the tip, the better. Remove any lower leaves before inserting the tip in the rooting medium.

Cane cuttings are used for propagating dumbcane, Chinese evergreen, dracaena, and similar plants with cane - like stems. Cut the cane three inches above the soil line and then cut it into pieces two to three inches long.

The circular rings, or leaf scars, contain dormant buds or eyes. Each piece should have two of these circular rings. Place the cuttings slightly below the surface of the rooting medium, making sure the eye is facing up.

The eye will eventually form a new stem, and the remaining stock plant will also sprout a new stem.

Whole leaf cuttings are leaves, with or without stalks. Insert the leaf base into the cutting medium just far enough to hold the leaf in place. If the leaf has a stalk, it should not be more than 1 1/2 inches long.

Leaf section cuttings are used to propagate Rex begonia and snake plants. The leaves are cut into pieces two to three inches long and inserted into the rooting medium right side up.

English ivy, pothos, grape ivy, geranium, philodendron, peperomia, hydrangea, and the like are propagated by leaf - bud cuttings. A leaf - bud cutting is a single leaf with a stem 1 to 2 1/2 inches long.

The material needed for rooting cuttings are the rooting medium, a container, rooting hormone, a sharp knife or scissors, a plastic bag and the cuttings. The containers should be at least three inches deep but not more than six.

The rooting medium can be either sand, sphagnum moss, peat moss, vermiculite, perlite or soil. It should be moist, well-drained and sterile. Rooting hormones are optional. A container without drainage holes is best.

cellor and grand bailiff for the order.



The honor, announced in November by an emissary of Queen Juliana in New York, resulted in part from a series of lectures Dr. Ellens delivered between 1962 and 1972 in the headquarters of U.S. Army Chaplain School, Fort Hamilton, N.Y.

The lectures dealt with questions of national and international policy which became crucial concerns during the U.S. involvement in Vietnam.

## Fr. Reid of St. Agatha is dead

The Rev. John T. Reid, who founded St. Agatha Catholic Parish in Redford Township in 1948 and has been its pastor ever since, died Monday in Florida.

Cardinal John Dearden, archbishop of Detroit, officiated for the funeral mass Thursday in the church at 19650 Beech Daley. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre.

Fr. Reid, who was ordained in 1932, led his parish

in a 25th anniversary celebration during 1973. Various events throughout the year marked the parish's quarter-century of service.

The clergyman celebrated his first mass in this area June 16, 1948, and saw St. Agatha grow through the years. Its facilities now include a sanctuary, complete grade school and high school, and a rectory, convent and gym.







# Lower struggle foreseen in recycling proposal

State Sen. Carl D. Pursell (R-Plymouth) said the purpose of the resource recovery bill, which he and three other senators introduced last October, is to work for recycling of solid wastes and to work for long-range goals such as developing by-products of energy.

Pursell spoke at an environmental conference held last Friday in the Observer Newspapers' board room.

Senate Bill 946, which was referred to the Conservation, Environment and Tourism Committee, would develop a state authority consisting of eight members in the environmental protection branch of the Department of Natural Resources.

Pursell said local governments would submit plans to this authority on what they are going to do with their trash. The function of the state authority is to oversee the whole area of solid waste recovery.

However, he added, "Whether we can enforce it on the local government remains to be seen."

Pursell said there will undoubtedly be a power struggle between the state and local governments. "That is fought out in every bill," he said.

To influence land use matters, Rep. Joseph Forbes, (D-Oak Park) said that citizens should write or talk to their local officials. Rep. John F. Markes (D-Westland) added that one well-written letter on a subject can be just as valuable as 100 letters. He said it is important that a person show that he understands an issue.

Also, Rep. Raymond J. Smit (R-Ann Arbor) denounced a project called "Super Sewer," which proposes to gather waste water from the Huron River and dump it into Lake Erie.

Smit called this project a product of archaic technology and said he would like to see the money spent for more elaborate treatment systems. Smit said that rather than putting quality water back into the Huron River, this project would just deprive it of some flow.

He said that the program cannot be justified economically either in that it would cost around \$300 million.

In addition, Pursell said that a project in the Department of Natural Resources

to clean up Phoenix, Wilcox and Newburgh Lakes in Wayne County will be used as a demonstration project for the entire State of Michigan.

"We are going to demonstrate that we can make lakes that are unproductive useful," he said.

## Forbes doubts OK on land bill

A bill that would set up a state land use commission is "a shambles," and one of its supporters doubts it will get the 56 necessary House votes to pass the Legislature this session.

State Rep. Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park) spoke on House Bill 5055 last Friday at an environmental conference in the Observer Newspapers' building. Forbes' district includes the east portion of Southfield.

Forbes said the bill, which provides for a seven-member land use commission to deal with zoning and all forms of land use, is having trouble because of the power that was originally to go to the Land Commission.

However, because several local officials opposed the bill on the grounds that it would curtail their power, he said that much compromising has been done and the wealth of power now rests with the local government.

Also, Forbes said that each interest group brings in its own ideas and added several amendments.

In addition, Forbes said that the bill lacks endorsements of the Michigan Municipal League and the Michigan Township Association, two interest groups who have much input in this bill.

Despite these difficulties, however, Forbes is optimistic about getting the bill out of the Towns and Counties Committee and getting a good bi-partisan land use bill. He said there is no rush to get a bill passed this session, but added that there should be one by next session.

"It's necessary to have some kind of land use bill whether this session or next," he said.

Currently there are two federal land use bills in Congress which Forbes said are progressing better than the Michigan bill.

"And it may be that we will get a federal land use

bill before we will get a state one," he said.

House Bill 5055 was sponsored by Rep. Philip Mastin (D-Hazel Park), chairman of the Towns and Counties Committee. The land use commission it would provide for would be appointed by the governor and housed in the Department of Natural Resources.

This commission would specifically compile a land use plan consisting of:

- a description of existing and future land uses;
- a designation of critical land areas;
- establishment of goals pertaining to lands where growth should be encouraged or discouraged, lands where agricultural, forestry or mineral productivity should be reserved, lands which should be reserved for public use and lands where future growth should be encouraged;
- programs of plan implementation.

## Grant renewed

SOUTHFIELD The Southfield 46th District Court Probation Department has received a second year \$54,435 state and federal grant for an improvement program.

Continuation of the grant was approved by the Office of Criminal Justice Programs. The city will contribute \$2,865 in matching funds.

## State funds asked for drug fight

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners is seeking state funds to help finance planning of a comprehensive approach to drug and alcoholism problems through the new County Office of Substance Abuse Services.

The commissioners have authorized the new county office to apply for a \$15,000 grant from the Michigan Office of Substance Abuse Services.

Matched by \$15,000 in county funds, the money also would be used to provide staff services in the evaluation of the use of the controversial heroin substitute, methadone, in addiction treatment programs.

The Board of Commissioners recently appointed a committee of eight physicians and other professionals to conduct the methadone study.

In related action, the commissioners transferred a total of 10 drug and alcoholism programs from the Detroit-Wayne County Community Mental Health Services (Act 54) Board to the new County Office of Substance Abuse Services.

The County Board named Dr. Edward Leibson, former substance abuse chief for the Act 54 board, as acting director of the new county office.
