## The fire -- could Burnham family have been saved?

CANTON - "Could they have been saved?"

That question was asked over and over early Saturday morning following the tragic fire which claimed the lives of James and Sara Burnham, both 26, and their two children, Matthew, 4, and Steven, 23 months.

Cindy Brandon of 44140 Arlington lives across the street from the Burnhams in the two-year-old subdivision. The families were good friends,

and she was one of the first to notice the blaze.

"I kept thinking, 'what could I do... what could I do?'" she said.

Mrs. Brandon, her husband, Ron, and Marlene DeVergilio, a neighbor two doors down, sat around the kitchen table Saturday morning after the blaze.

They were still shaken about the tragedy that had claimed the lives of their friends. Occasionally they cried as they recounted the events.

The fire was first noticed in the Burnham house at 44139 Arlington shortly after 1 a.m. Saturday.

After waking her husband, Mrs. Brandon tried calling the Burnhams to tell them their brick and aluminum-sided house was on fire.

"I got a funny kind of a busy signal," she said, her hands trembling as she tried to light a cigaret. (She found later the heat melted the phones.)

"I ran across the street and tried screaming to wake

them up. I was screaming at the windows... there was no one there," she said.

"I heard a big explosion in the back and then all these little popping noises. That's all I could hear from the house."

Her husband Ron ran across the street barefoot and tried to wrench off the aluminum storm door to get to the Burnhams.

"I took my shirt off to cover my mouth to try to keep out the smoke," he said.

"When I broke through the front door, Jim was lying on the stairs, and the smoke was too thick to get to him."

"You couldn't see two inches in front of your face," he added.

Brandon received a cut and burns on his feet before getting a pair of shoes from Joseph Cornely, the Burnhams' next door neighbor at 44151 Arlington.

Mrs. Cornely said they first noticed the fire because their dog was barking. "That's what really woke us up," she said.

When she called the fire department, they said they were on their way. The engines arrived about three minutes later, she estimated.

## New consolidation vote date

The special election on the consolidation of Plymouth Township and the City of Plymouth has been postponed from April 2 to May 7.

The change of dates was agreed upon by the State Boundary Commission when Michigan State University officials claimed they could not complete a study in the allotted time and asked for an extension.

Announcement of the change in dates was made Tuesday afternoon by Fred Yockey, Plymouth city

manager. Yockey said the new date for the first (consolidation) election would be May 7 with the second on July 2 for charter commissioners.

The new date for candidates filing has been changed to May 14 and was announced officially by Irving Rozian, a member of the Boundary Commission, who stated that the new dates were adopted unanimously.

## Random selection for PHS defeated

PLYMOUTH - Random selection as a means of balancing the student population at Plymouth - Salem and Plymouth - Canton High Schools is stalled for the time being.

By a 4 - 2 vote, the Plymouth Board of Education agreed - at least for another year - to continue with the present system of using the middle school attendance areas as guidelines.

In the meantime, the administration was asked to submit a feasibility report on the question that threatens to polarize the community. This is to be followed by several public hearings.

That was the upshot of action taken Monday night when Trustees Fred Penar and Gary Mirto clashed repeatedly over the question. Penar favors the random selection method and its early implementation. He was unsuccessful in gaining board approval of resolution that called for an early administration report on the question.

The board split 3-3 on the Penar resolution with Trustees Marda Benson and E.J. McClendon voting for it. Trustee George Lawton was absent.

Mirto then introduced a resolution calling for a feasibility study "with no specif-

ic school year to be indicated."

Presumably, the report would be followed by a series of public hearings although it was not specifically mentioned in the resolution.

"You didn't mention the time you wanted the report," Penar said. "Do you want it by 1980?"

"1984 would be too soon as far as I'm concerned," shot back Mirto.

Penar argued that the random selection method was an "inherent part" of the centennial complex, as proposed by its originator, Russell Isbister, a former school superintendent.

"Nothing is inherent until

the board takes action on it," retorted Mirto.

Repeatedly, Mirto stressed that the public has not had ample time to study the issue nor had the opportunity to voice its opinion. Trustee Joseph Gray agreed, declaring that the district was courting danger by bringing up the controversial question with a millage election coming up soon.

Penar was in agreement with the point that the public should be consulted, adding that the administration analysis he asked for "could be the starting point for public discussion."

## Windsor Park Assn. vows Moceri election

CANTON - If the Canton Township Board of Trustees approves the proposed Moceri Project, the community's residents are going to get the final say.

That is the promise being made by the Windsor Park Homeowners Assn. which has already drawn up plans to force the issue to a referendum through a community-wide petition drive.

According to Carl Parsell, president of the homeowners group, a petition sample has already been laid out, routes for the township-wide drive have been mapped and a voter registration drive has already begun.

The petitions and the drive will be modeled after last summer's successful drive in Plymouth Township to force a referendum on extending sewers into the western part of the township.

ganize the drive) until they vote on it. We've got to be prepared," he said.

"We're not out to get a petition drive, we're out to defeat that project in an all-out fight," said Parsell.

Windsor Park subdivision is located between Sheldon and Lilley roads - immediately south of the proposed Moceri Project site. Its residents have been the most vocal opponents to the pro-

ject since it was first proposed.

"But it's important to stress that we're not antagonists from one small area," the association president said, adding that his group will coordinate the petition drive to cover the entire township "if and when the vote (approving the project) comes."

In preparation for that, Parsell said, the Windsor Park Homeowners Assn. is

now using its newsletter to promote voter registrations and to boost its own membership.

The association has scheduled a meeting on its proposed referendum drive at 8 p.m. Monday at Plymouth-Canton High School's cafeteria.

Parsell said all area residents are welcome to attend that meeting or show support for the association by writing to its post office box 269, Plymouth.

## Napier Road crash kills 2, injures 2

Two men were killed and two were injured, one seriously, early Sunday morning when the car they were riding in went off Napier Road and slammed into a tree in Superior Township.

Dead on arrival at Wayne County General Hospital were William C. Drummond, 18, of 640 Simpson, Plymouth, and Brian Scan-

nell, 16, of 39500 W. Warren, Westland.

Reported in critical condition at Wayne County General is Mike Godfrey, 18, of Connersville, Ind. Treated at the hospital and later released was Glenn Roberts, 16, of 46020 Baban Rd., Plymouth.

A Washtenaw County Sheriff spokesman said the accident occurred about 2:30 a.m. Sunday on Napier just

south of Plymouth Road.

The spokesman said apparently the car had just come over a hill, went off the road and into the tree. Police believe the car was "traveling too fast for the slippery road conditions and that the driver lost control."

Roberts had climbed out of the wreckage, apparently in a daze and wandered down the road. He was discovered by one of the wreckers about an hour after the scene had been cleared, police said.

# Wayne County's 1-mill crime tax proposal faces fight on local front

A one mill tax for beefed-up police services proposed at the Wayne County level is proving unpopular with Observerland cities and townships.

Most local governments here would receive less money from the tax split proposed by County Board Chairman Robert FitzPatrick than if they were to levy an equivalent amount of millage themselves.

The county board's general government committee will hold a public hearing on the suggestion Thursday at 7:30 p.m. in the Westland City Hall, 36601 Ford Road.

As FitzPatrick (D-Detroit) suggested it, the county would ask voters to levy a one mill property tax (\$1 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation. The county would keep 20 per cent and return 80 per cent to the 43 cities and townships on a formula basis.

Half the local share would be distributed on the basis of each unit's 1970 population — a boon to those units with stable or declining populations. The other half would be distributed on the basis of each unit's total valuation.

Garden City and Westland would appear to gain by the formula; Redford Township, Livonia, the two Plymouths and Canton Township to lose.

While FitzPatrick argues that residents would bear less than half the burden of the proposed one mill tax because industry would be required to pick up a large portion, that argument applies more to the heavily industrialized communities than to the more residential Observerland cities and townships.

If the public safety tax plan is successful, this is what the formula allocation of money will mean to local communities:

•In Garden City, \$140,000 could be returned to the city. This is actually \$32,000 more than the city would get if it levied the millage itself. Garden City officials, who are in the middle of police union negotiations, are optimistic about the benefits.

•In Livonia, however, the picture is not nearly as bright. That city stands to receive almost \$120,000 less from a county imposed millage than if it were to collect the equivalent tax on its own. Mayor Edward H. McNamara refused to take a position in opposition to the county proposal, but said that he's "not really convinced that it's good for our community." Livonia "absolutely" needs the money, he said, but admitted that "the so-called 'have' districts ... would, in a sense, be penalized."

In Redford Township, officials reacted negatively. That community would receive about \$25,000 less under the county plan than if it were to levy 0.8 mill on its own. Supervisor Bill Robbins said the plan ends up subsidizing the City of Detroit, which, he admits, does need the funding, but also benefits communities (such as Dearborn) which don't. Under the plan, Detroit would gain about \$711,000 and Dearborn would gain nearly \$202,000 over a self-taxation plan.

Westland is the only other Observerland community which would come out on top if the county plan is approved, but even Westland officials are reticent about the proposal.

Westland stands to come out ahead by about \$36,500 if the county plan is adopted over a self-imposed 0.8 of a mill, but Mayor Eugene McKinney says he has mixed feelings about the proposal. "The county plan is basically a county revenue sharing plan," McKinney said, "but I question a formula which gives Dearborn \$600,000 and Westland \$300,000." The two cities are about the same size.

In addition, McKinney is also hesitant because his city is already planning a local police millage proposal this summer.

•Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch believes the commission is "going to have a

hard time selling" the one mill proposal, and in that city, which will receive nearly \$7,500 less under the county plan than it would by levying the millage locally, she may be right.

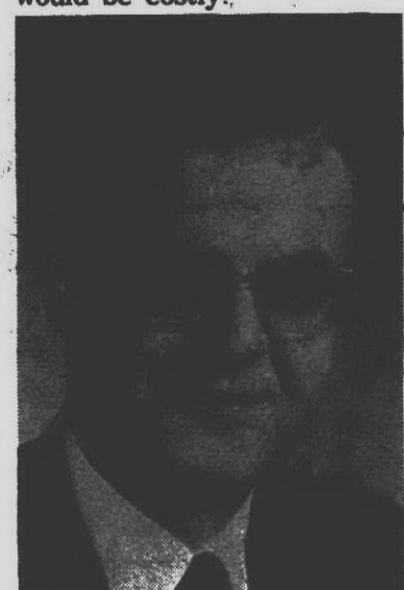
•In Plymouth Township, the county plan would result in nearly 30 per cent less money being returned than if the township levied on its own. The community would receive \$100,000 from the county, but could raise \$129,500 locally at the same cost to residents. Clerk Helen Richardson feels that while the proposal may "bail out the county" she does not see what it will do for the township.

•Also on the short end would be Canton Township, which could raise \$91,500 if left to its own devices, but would get only \$67,800 under the county plan — a loss of \$23,700.

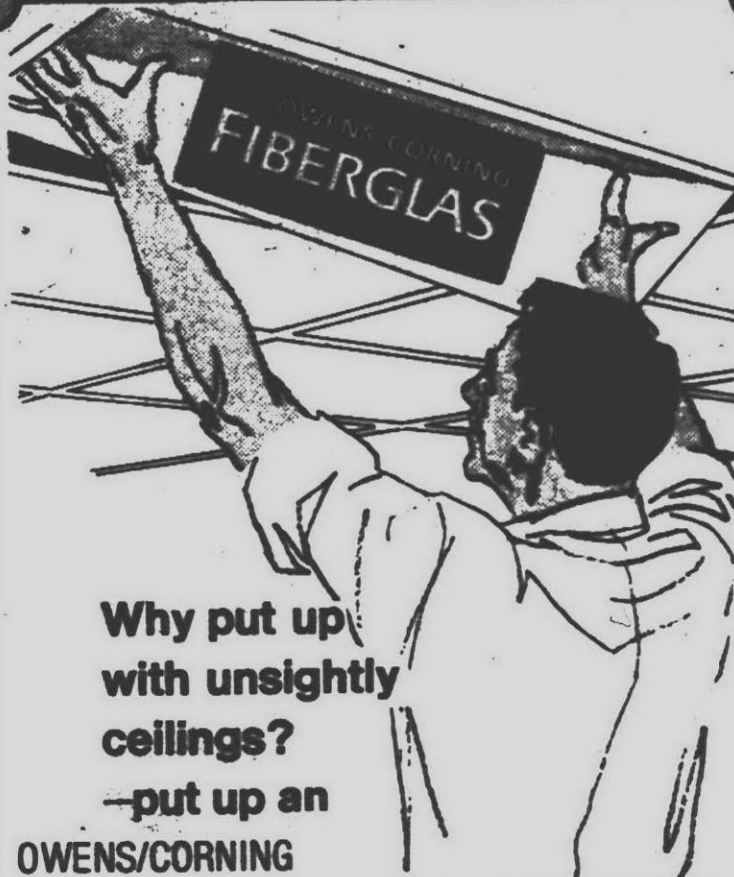
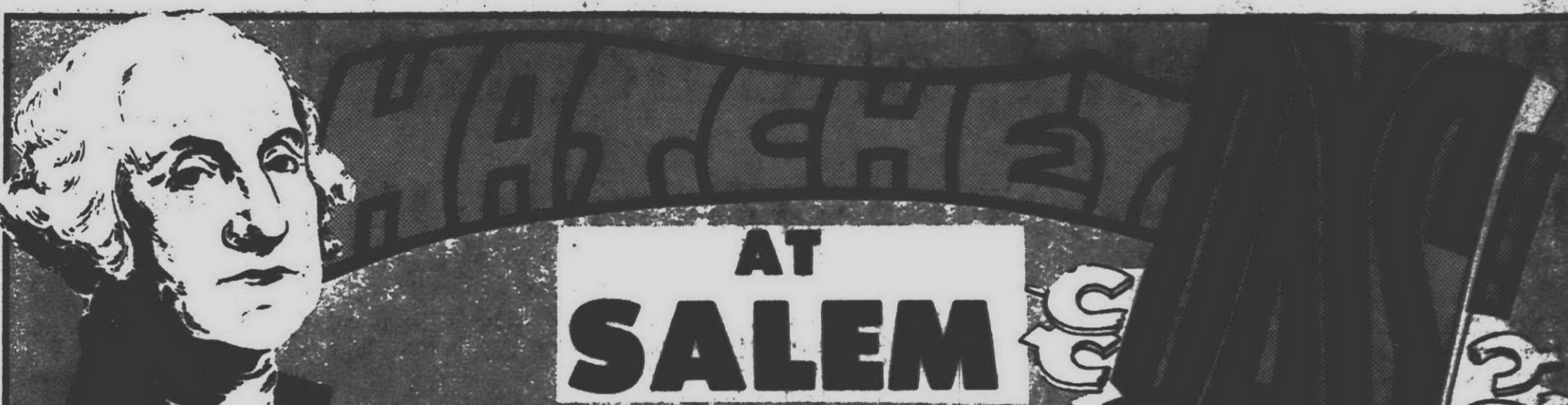
Spokesmen for most communities were willing to admit that more money for police services was necessary both in their own communities and at the county level, but most are concerned that the formula proposal isn't the way to proceed.

Westland's mayor hopes to see some change in the formula for the distribution of the millage and in the duration of the millage (a 10-year period is now part of the proposal) before he could support the package. Livonia's mayor, too, remains unconvinced.

The Redford Township supervisor and the Plymouth Township clerk believe that the proposal to bring the matter to the voters in a special election is unwise and would be costly.

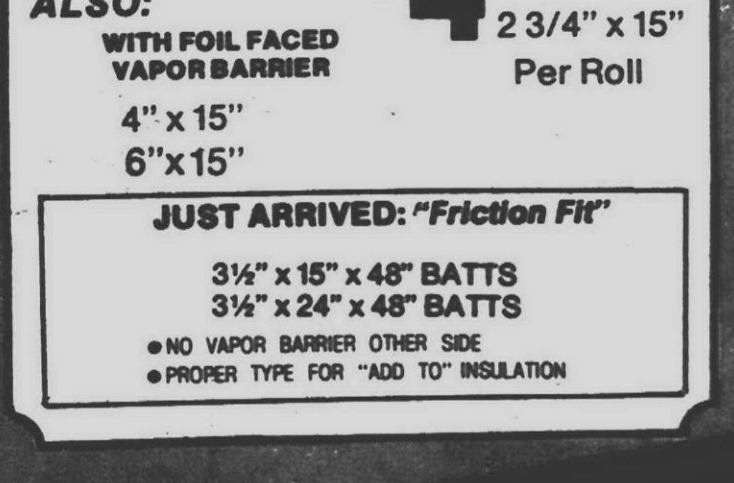

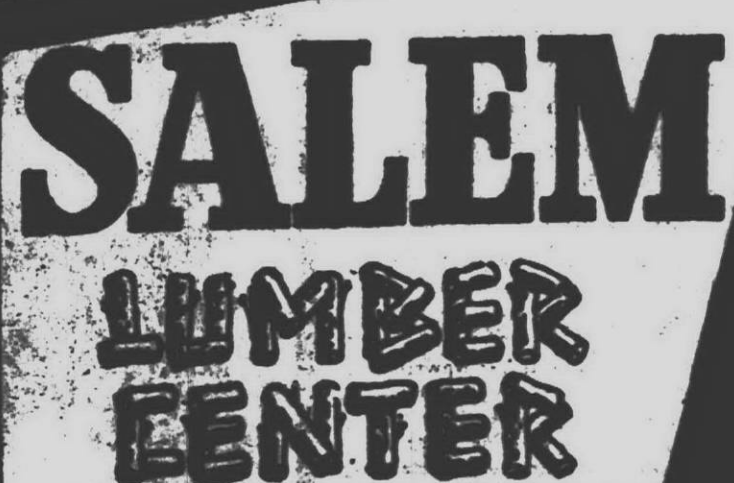

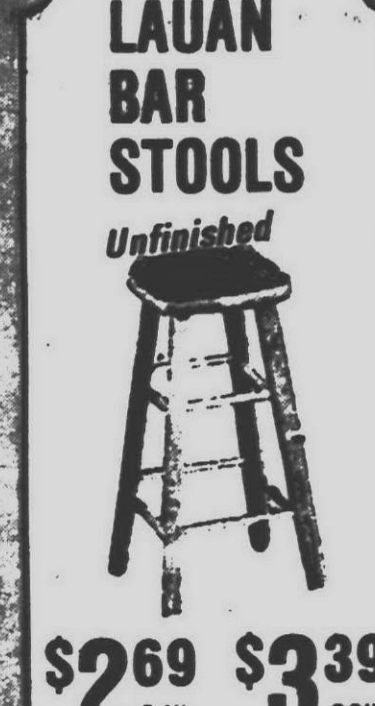

# Plymouth C of C board joins Moceri opposition

PLYMOUTH — The board of directors of the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce has gone on record as being opposed to the regional shopping center known as the Moceri Project.

Proposed for the southeast corner of Joy and Sheldon roads in Canton Township, the Westland-type center, has been approved by the Canton Planning Commission and now awaits review by the Wayne County Planning Commission before a final decision is made by the Canton Township Board of Trustees.

The Plymouth Chamber of Commerce voiced its opposition through a letter to the Canton Township board signed by Chamber President Fred Hill.

That letter read: "The Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce has been following the developments concerning the Moceri Project for the last several months.

"The board of directors for the chamber has been hesitant in becoming embroiled

in the matter because of the fear that any comments that the chamber might make would be viewed as being an extension of a parochial attitude and that the chamber has a purely selfish economic interest.

"Nonetheless, the board decided that the chamber should express itself on this matter to avoid the impression that it had no opinion or that we approved of the project as presented.

"We hope that our comments are not parochial in nature and do not express a selfish attitude. They are as follows:

"There should be complete economic and market analysis before this property is rezoned and the project approved. There appear to be valid questions about the extent of the market area, the existing and potential population and the existing and future commercial competition to this project. In short, we feel there should be a complete impact study of this project.

"We are concerned about

the traffic problems that will be generated around this proposed project particularly on Joy Road, Sheldon Road, and Main Street in Plymouth Township and in Plymouth. We note in this regard that nothing tangible has been suggested by the Wayne County Road Commission to solve the traffic problems that would be generated by this project. We note further that the proposed Morton Taylor Road has no definite completion date. In addition, it is our observation that the traffic problems created by this proposed project would affect all of the communities involved and not just Canton Township.

"The chamber board expressed a number of other concerns that probably would be answered by an economic or market analysis. The principal concern expressed was in regard to tax base. That is, would any advantage be temporary because it might stimulate more residential construction in the area.

"There is nothing profound in our comments or questions. We are hopeful that

our suggestions, although not requested, will be gratefully received.

"The chamber believes that we have an integrated community notwithstanding the fact that said community is made up of several separate governmental entities.

"The scope and size of the proposed project is of such magnitude that its impact upon our community cannot be readily understood without further study. However, we would like the final decision which is to be made on this project to be made only after all possible information as to its impact on a variety of subjects has been gathered. Therefore, we reiterate our request that a complete study be made through the combined efforts of the communities."

The letter was also forwarded to the Canton Chamber of Commerce — which has gone on record as supporting the Moceri Project — with the idea that representatives from each of the two chambers would meet to discuss the proposed project.

## OLGC girls end sports era

PLYMOUTH — An interesting era of girls' sports ended on a triumphal note last Saturday night at Our Lady of Good Counsel when the basketball team defeated Holy Redeemer, 63 to 24, in its farewell appearance.

Ending the era was not a choice of the girls, but came about when the Catholic Youth Organization (CYO), of which they were a part, became affiliated with the Michigan State High School Athletic Assn.

Under the rules of the state group, teams must represent high schools. Inasmuch as Our Lady of Good Counsel school goes no higher than the eighth grade, it no longer is eligible for league or tournament play.

"When the CYO became ambitious and wanted to compete for state championships," said Jack Corey, OLGC coach, "it meant the end of an era at OLGC. Only one other school in the CYO league was affected. That school is St. James in Ferndale."

From now on, the girls who still have a desire to play in leagues and tournaments, will compete at Plymouth high schools.

The OLGC girls who brought down the curtain on the sports Saturday night boast an enviable record. They have been playing together for years in both basketball and softball.

Over the stretch of the last few years, they have been beaten only once. That was a 46 to 35 basketball defeat suffered in the game with St. Alphonsus with whom they shared the championship.

Their final appearance as an OLGC team was one of the best of the season. The result never was in doubt. Sue Myrtle paced the team with 23 points, while Phyllis Cunningham added 14 and Chris Klucka contributed 10.

Hoben told the board that a consensus of principals at both the high schools and middle schools indicated that they are in favor of keeping the present method at least until the '75-'76 school year.

One reason for this, Hoben said, is they are 70 per cent into next year's registration.

Later, however, Hoben admitted, in questioning by Penar, that there is little pre-work necessary in instituting the random selection method.

"You could do it tomorrow if you had to," probed Penar.

"Yes, I would have to say that was true," answered Hoben.

Hoben added that the principals favored the attendance policy method because "much controversy is centered around this particular change...particularly after

the majority of the parents and students in counseling situations have been told they will attend one or the other building."

The discrepancy in the current eighth grade was approximately 70 students in a balance between the two buildings, Hoben said.

The superintendent also said that the principals had received comments from parents who were concerned over the short time between the announcement and the implementation.

"In light of our need to go to the public for bonding and renewal issues in the ensuing year, I feel that the (principal's) recommendations to put off the adjustments for another year are well taken," he concluded.

Only person from the audience who asked to speak on the question was Marcia Borowski, a recent unsuccessful candidate for a seat on the board of education.

She said that the board's discussion on random selection was premature.

What the board should do, she said, is decide on the concept for the complex. She said it was "impossible" to make a decision on attendance guidelines without "really knowing that."

# Strange things are happening

There are mysterious, powerful, and only dimly understood forces brewing here in the suburbs these days. Consider these symptoms, which link themselves together into a singular pattern:

• In 1973 the Michigan meat boycott got its start from a group of housewives in Farmington.

• When the cross district school bus issue was at its hottest, more than half the houses in the affected suburbs suddenly sprouted "This Family Will Not Be Bused" signs in front windows.

• Many of the men now involved in the strike and threats of violence by independent truckers are suburbanites, profit oriented individual businessmen caught in what they regard as an unfair government squeeze.

• Contrary to the predictions of most political experts, suburban votes for George Wallace swamped other contenders in the Michigan Democratic presidential primary in 1972, and later that year highly conservative Bob Huber won an upset victory in the middle-riding 18th congressional district that includes Troy.

The pattern, of course, is for suburbanites - generally regarded as staunch defenders of the status quo with little regard for radical ideas of direct action - to get directly involved in protest movements of a radical sort when they are sufficiently steamed up about something.

A University of Michigan sociologist, Donald Warren, has been studying the rise of "Middle American Radicals," and some of his research findings are of enormous importance for us in the suburbs.

Warren says that direct action movements such as the meat boycott constitute responses to "a problem directly affecting many families and one which had not previously occurred nor been carried out within the purview of a union, protest group or other 'established' structure."

People who join such movements are not necessarily rich or poor or liberal or conservative, but they do seem to have some common characteristics, according to Warren.

"They have a lot of trust in the system, but it's being thwarted by interest groups and their own interest group does not have much to say," Warren finds. Their frustrated trust finds a hostile outlet against societal groups both above and below them, who seem to enjoy special government treatment.

In the past, such people were fairly well represented through traditional interest groups such as churches, unions and political parties. But, Warren finds, people feel churches are courting other groups, union leaders are out of touch with their rank and file, and political parties are ossified and unresponsive.

"Middle American Radicals see formal organizations not holding to clear cut rules and not being responsive to their own concerns," according to Warren.

For once, it's nice to find a sociologist who seems to be making sense.

Most folks, whether they live in the suburbs or not, traditionally have solved large social problems through their established interest group organizations. Workers confronted employment problems through unions; parents dealt with school problems through the PTA; liberals depended on the Democrats to represent them, and conservatives the Republicans.

But the nature of the problems that affect our lives has changed so rapidly in the past few years that established interest groups have not evolved quickly enough to keep up. What is the union's position on the gas shortage? How do PTAs feel about the escalating price of meat? What will the Democrats do to stop inflation? How do the Republicans feel about busing?

Ten years ago, these were not even issues. Today they are the stuff of immediate, intense concern for suburbanites. Yet no established interest group has been able to be flexible enough to express their concerns.

Result? Frustration. Impatience with existing interest groups, political parties, governments at all levels. A tendency to take direct action, to create a new group to take a relevant stand on a problem. A direct reversal of the out-dated notion that suburbanites are stolid, conservative, slow, non-active.

And a profoundly widespread feeling that the existing political system is ineffective and irrelevant.

My guess is that this process will go a lot further before it reverses itself. Our established interest groups, so far, have not shown much flexibility or interest in representing people when new issues show up, and until they do the mood of frustration and irritation which so characterizes the Middle American Radicals will continue to be one of the most powerful forces in the suburbs.

## Politicians getting bad rap

It's fashionable these days to dump on politicians, which is precisely why I intend to be nice to them today. It's not that I'm feeling sorry for them or even trying to make up for my past fulminations.

The truth is that our party politicians are getting a bad rap from the Watergate fallout, et al. Look at it this way:

Would the Republican National Committee have authorized the Watergate break-in? No way.

Would the Democratic National Committee have done it to the GOP if they'd had the chance? Probably never.

Would the Michigan Democratic State Central Committee have uttered flatulent sounds over a car-top loudspeaker when a Republican candidate attempted to speak to union men at a factory gate? Doubtful. And vice-versa for the GOP.

The point is that political parties are governed by elected committees whose members are answerable to the folks back home. In any such committee of 50 or 100, at least one member will be honest and blow the whistle on a dirty trick proposal.

President Nixon himself admitted (1) he always ran his campaigns through a personal organization rather than a party and (2) he failed to supervise adequately his 1972 reelection effort. His political party wasn't to blame.

Recall some of the local campaign excesses:

• The 1973 Garden City mayoral race - nonpartisan.

• Moelke vs. McNamara for Livonia mayor in 1970 - nonpartisan.

• The enemies of Westland Mayor Gene McKinney in 1971 and '73 - nonpartisan.

• Farmington School District internal politicking of the past few years - nonpartisan.

• Vince Pettipren's effort against Sen. Bill Faust in 1970 - an intra-party brawl; the Democratic Party wasn't to blame.

I haven't had occasion to collect figures, but I strongly suspect the bulk of fair campaign practice charges stem either from nonpartisan affairs or from personally-run campaigns in partisan races for which a party wasn't responsible.

If I am correct that par-

ty-run campaigns are cleaner than personal campaigns, why is it so?

Parties are issue-oriented rather than personality-oriented, for one thing.

Parties are more or less democratically governed and operate in a relative fish bowl, for another.

Parties don't have the kinds of funds to throw around that millionaires and labor union leaders do.

Parties have little to offer in the way of patronage any more. The people who work in them are, for the most part, as unselfish and dedicated to the public interest as the Lions who help the sightless or the Candy Strippers who help out in our mental health facilities.

It's too bad our political parties have suffered in prestige and membership at a time when we genuinely need

watchdogs over government. But you as an individual can help.

This is the time of year when Republicans are selling Lincoln Day banquet tickets and Democrats Jefferson-Jackson tickets. They're moderate in price, the oratory is several cuts above the usual after-dinner bellowings, and the people are nice. In both parties.

## Energy crisis affects homes

The national energy crisis has affected most suburban households in many little ways.

In some, it is turning down the thermostat a few degrees. In others, it means adjusting personal schedules so car pools can be formed.

In recent weeks, the crisis has taken on a new twist with anxious mothers watching their youngsters start off for school in what looks like the middle of the night.

But with the change in life styles and habits in suburbia, there is another dimension of the energy crisis that has yet to be felt.

That is the impact on local governments and your tax bills.

Many families are staying at home or close to home on the weekends instead of filling up the gas tank on Friday night and heading for northern Michigan for snowmobiling or fishing.

Instead of spreading out a state road map to find the best recreation areas, suburban families will soon be checking street maps of their own community (or the one next door) to find a place for the family to spend a weekend.

In some cases, this will be simple wooded areas where picnics can be held.

In others, such as during the winter months, it means finding the nearest ice rink with an available patch of ice for skating.

In the summer, it will mean tennis courts, swimming pools, bicycle trails, nature trails, just to mention a few.

A suburban recreation director said recently at a private meeting of his city officials the energy crisis may force him to plan for a rebalancing of recreation facilities.

This is due to families staying close to home on weekends instead of driving across the state for activities.

If local communities plan ahead, the recreational facilities will result in multi-million dollar bond issues to finance important buildings and developments.

It will also mean added operating funds on a continuing basis to staff the facilities.

At the same time, cities are predicting a sharp drop in state revenues rebated to them through gasoline and weight taxes.

The shift of car buying habits has already caused serious layoffs in the auto industry, which has an obvious impact on suburban families. The layoffs mean less income tax paid to the state and less rebated to cities and townships.

If current city services are to be kept at an even level and recreation budgets to be increased substantially, city officials will have to look to their constituents to pick up more of the tax bill through local millages.

And who said the energy crisis isn't real?

Don't many of us know persons, who, when they have done something for us, have cheered us, say, when we thank them, "Oh, I enjoyed it?"

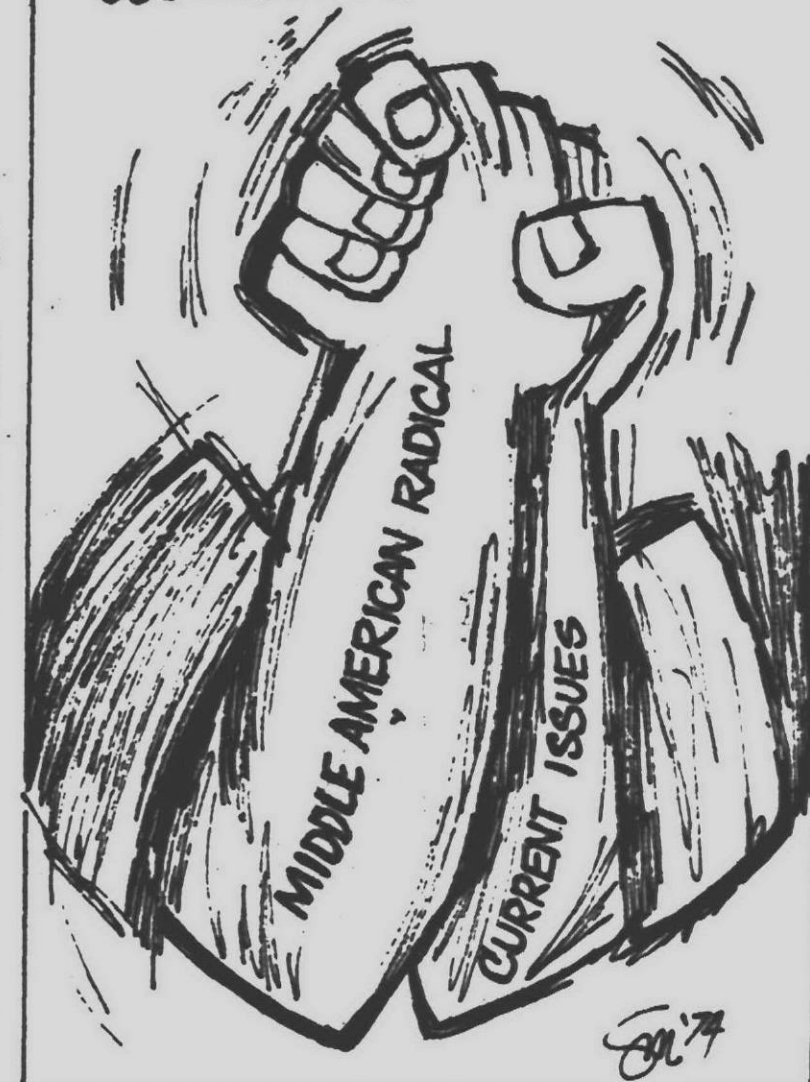
Would we could all be like that. All we can do is to try and emulate them, attempt to clear a dark day.

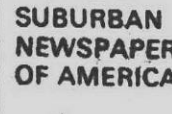

## Is strong, full time mayor the answer?

EDWARD H. McNAMARA, mayor of Livonia, likes occasionally to meet on a Saturday morning for steak and eggs with private business conferees in a particular Plymouth hotel dining room, and every time he does Ed must thank his lucky stars that his is not a government of committees.

Realize, if you will, that each of our community business cliques has its own habits about coffee and Danish rolls, as the saying goes. Really, this is sort of a Grossingerism for the interflow of information between those on the dais and those in front of it.

In peaceful, placid, placid Plymouth, the meeting point

for the moguls is a round table in the Mayflower Hotel. Around its board gather from hour to hour shifts of attorneys, landlords, tycoons of finance and spokesmen for the over-taxed.

An interloper tells me that only recently Mayor McNamara was off in his corner, deeply engrossed in how to make a legitimate buck, while there paraded through the round table coffee clache seven ex-mayors of his neighboring town, Plymouth.

By name they were Bill Hartmann, Dick Wernette, Jim Jabara, Bob Shcock, Jim Houk, Jim McKee and Harold Gaudier. This was

all in the space of 90 minutes before 9:30, mind you, and at that hour no one would expect Plymouth's present mayor, Mrs. Beverly McAninch, to have completed her morning beautification.

Plymouth, Farmington, and Farmington Hills select their mayors as a popularity contest from among councilmen rather than at large. Southfield, Westland, Garden City and Livonia make mayoral candidates put their qualifications on the line for all to examine, and then give the winner the authority that goes with it. In the first three instances it's more of a titular, society-type title than functional.

What this amounts to - particularly the emphasis on Plymouth - is the fact that this spring the city and township of Plymouth are going to vote on incorporating as one municipality. If this is approved in each of those geographical units, then a nine-member charter commission yet to be elected will have to write the document that would establish the new framework of the unified Plymouth government.

Our aforesaid seven, Hartmann et al who have previously served as mayors, would seem on the surface to be guiding lights who should patrol pre-city interests in such a government, just as township supervisors from

the past, Maurice Breen and Jack McEwen, would join incumbent J. D. McLaren, in an honest appraisal of rural needs.

The outcome, I fear, would once again be a government of committees to which they were born. The McNamara philosophy is one to which they should listen - a strong, fulltime mayor leadership responsible personally to the voters.

Livonia's chief executive must become more and more convinced of it every Saturday that he visits the Mayflower and hears the ex officio harangue from across the room. So would the voters if they were tuned in.



# Even young students get sexual stereotypes

public lands to develop shale oil.

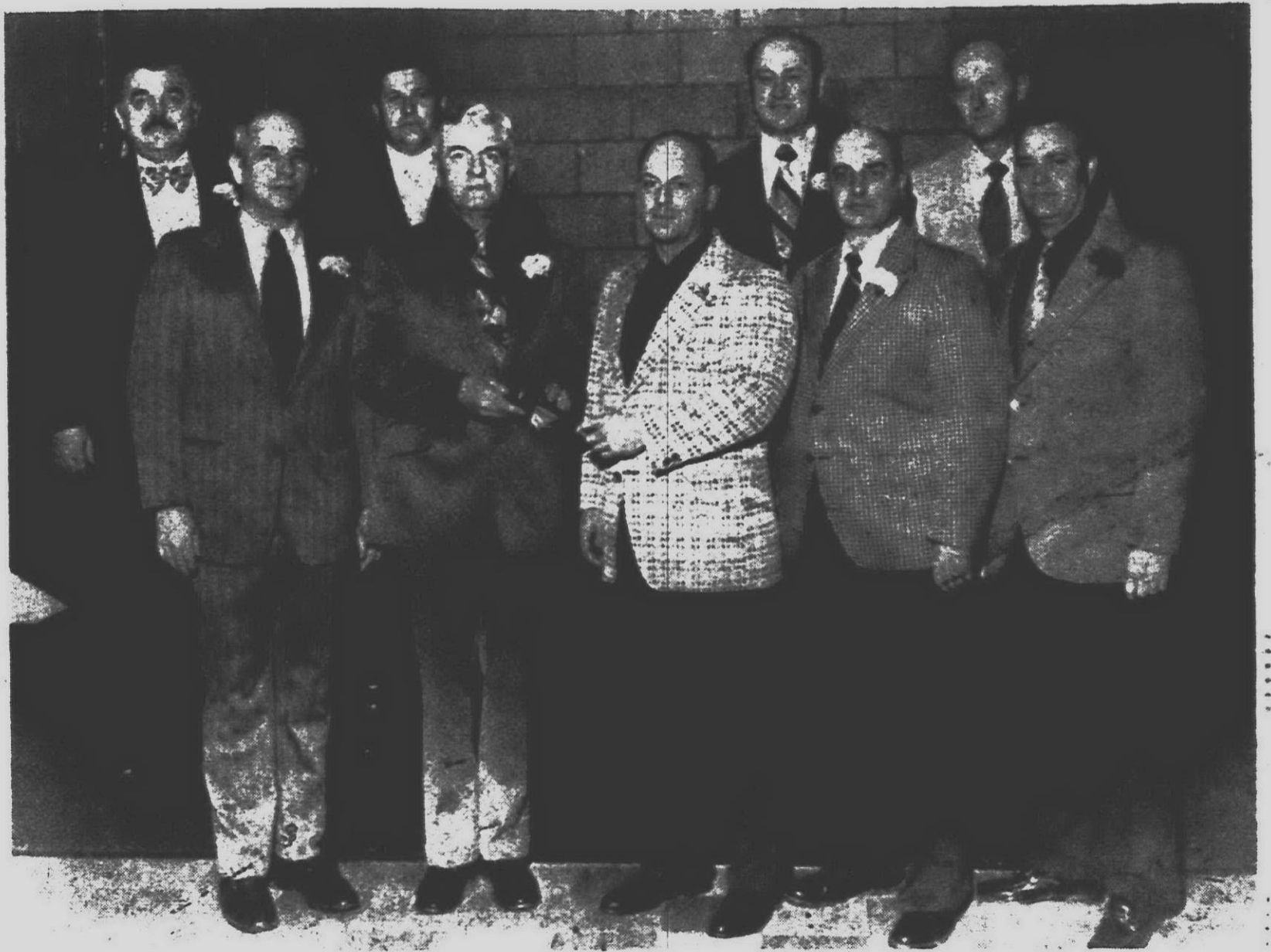

## Planners OK deeding PUD park to schools

CANTON -- The first step to enable Republic Development Corp. to deed Fellow Creek Park to Plymouth School District has been taken by the Canton Township Planning Commission.

The commission approved -- with five stipulations -- the proposed amendment to the Fellow Creek Planned Unit Development (PUD), passing it on the township board to begin legal proceedings.

Under the agreement, Republic Development Corp. must meet the following requirements: seed and grade the 9.519-acre property; pay

half the cost of a six foot fence; construct sidewalks between homes leading to the area and fence them from view; and assure the property's availability to the people of the PUD at all times making gates unnecessary.

Planning Commission Chairman Wes Kaiser explained, "We are taking the responsibility (for the property) away from Republic. We expect something back in return."

"Of course if the school board decides it doesn't want the property -- it goes back to the PUD."

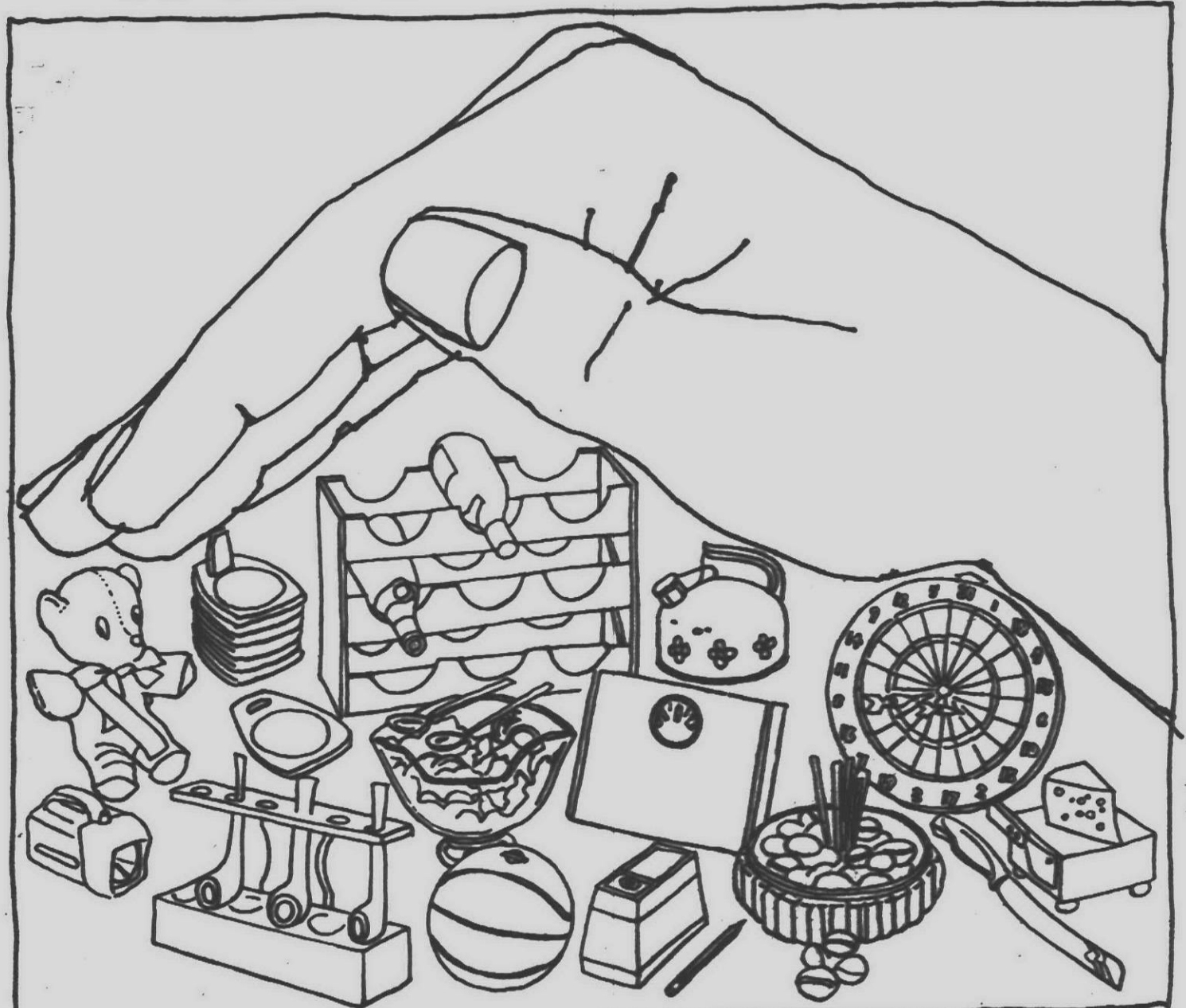

# The fire -- could Burnham family have been saved?

Two neighbors who lived behind the Burnhams also called the fire department, firemen report.

According to the official report, Darlene Burn and Ardish Apigian, both residents of the street behind the Burnhams, called to report seeing the blaze after hearing small explosions.

The explosions were apparently windows being blown out, said Canton Township Fire Chief Melvin Paulun.

"It's impossible to say when the fire began," the chief said. "The Burnhams may have discovered the fire too late."

Paulun said one indication was that there was an imprint on the wall where the body of the youngest child, 23-month-old Steven, lay in his crib. This showed the smoke and soot were already thick by the time the parents took the children into the master bedroom.

The fire chief hypothesized Burnham tried to get down stairs — his body was found at the foot of the stairs — and circle outside to help his wife and children escape through a bedroom window in the back of the house.

Taking the children out of their front bedrooms could have been a mistake since the heat was apparently worse in the back of the house where the fire started.

In attempting to enter the house to rescue the Burnhams, Sgt. Kenneth Witt, who was in charge of the department at the time, took a lungful of smoke.

He was admitted to Wayne County General Hospital and treated for smoke inhalation. He is being kept there for observation.

Paulun said state police fire investigators placed the cause of the fire as a candle left burning atop a television set in the family room on the first floor at the rear of the house.

The candle apparently ignited the curtains in the family room, and from there the blaze moved quickly.

Paulun said the furnace and an attic fan apparently fed oxygen to the fire as it spread from the first floor to the second.

Mrs. Brandon recalled the Burnhams had mentioned the candle — in the shape of a candy apple — was "burning strangely."

"There must have been a tremendous amount of heat," Paulun said, explaining the heat shattered the window in the oven in the kitchen.

He estimated it would take a heat of 1,000 degrees to do that.

"I don't believe anybody could live through that kind of heat," he said. "I think those people were gone before we even got the call."

The fire department's actions at the fire were criticized by many subdivision residents.

Windsor Park Homeowners' Assn., which represents the subdivision the Burnham home was in, sent a letter to Canton Township Board of Trustees calling for "an intensive investigation to determine all of the facts surrounding this terrible and frightening incident."

"It is our firm belief that only by a full and complete investigation and dissemination of facts can the officials of Canton Township expect or receive the continued confidence and support of the people of this community."

One of the Burnhams' neighbors, Herman Denery of 43806 Brandywine told The Plymouth Mail & Observer "the firemen sure didn't know what they were doing."

He said the firemen arrived with no ladders to put up to the second floor — which Paulun denies.

"There was a ladder at the rear window and a man with an air pack on his back tried to get inside," Paulun said. "He couldn't find anybody."

"We don't know the layout of those houses so what we do is go in and search. My men did a damn good job, I'd back them 100 per cent."

Paulun said criticism is frequent in fatal fires.

"They jump to conclusions too fast. They don't care about our men."

He cited Sgt. Witt's injury in a rescue attempt. "If that doesn't show we tried, then I don't know what does."

The chief added that although another fire which broke out in a trailer park at Michigan Avenue and Haggerty Road meant splitting the firefighters, his men did a satisfactory job at the Burnham house.

Mrs. DeVergilio said, "After the firemen got there, they didn't make any grand attempt to get in, but I think, in looking back at it, they knew that in a fire like that, no one was still alive."

"It's just amazing that in that short a time, four people could die."

Services for the Burnhams are being held at 1 p.m. today (Wednesday) in the Brown Funeral Home, 1616 Davison in Flint.

The family's survivors include: James' parents, Mr. and Mrs. Milton C. Burnham and his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. James L. Adams, all of Flint; brothers, Jon of Ann Arbor and Robert of Dublin, Calif.; a sister, Mrs. Helen Ottoman of Dunham Lake; Sara's parents, Mr. and Mrs. F. O. (Bob) Green of Hale; a sister, Susan Green of Ann Arbor, who had been visiting the family that evening; and a brother, Thomas Green of Flint.

Pressure is one part of basketball that most prep coaches must contend with from hour to hour, day to day and week to week throughout a season.

Usually it is heightened when you are on top of the ladder. Such is not the case around Churchill territory.

The area's No. 1 basketball club, which boasts an overall 14-1 mark has operated under this circumstance about as much as it has wound up in the loss column.

For the third time in a row, Churchill Coach Pat Montagnano emptied his bench early in the game with no doubt as to the outcome.

Churchill dumped Walled Lake Western, 73 to 52, to remain unbeaten in the Western Six and extend its string to eight consecutive wins since its solo loss to Franklin back on Jan. 4.

"We have had only three pressure games this season," said Montagnano whose Chargers are coming off a 19-6 season. "And these three have all been away from home, at Franklin, Waterford

Churchill topped Northville by three, Mott by one and lost to Franklin by six.

Churchill is averaging 64 points per game while its defense, No. 1 in the area, has given up only an average of 47 points a game.

"Sure the league is down but I still defy any team to take on our kids especially in

rebounding. Nobody will out-rebound us. Even the game we lost to Franklin, we still won the boards."

"You know something funny," said Montagnano. "It's not the pressure of the game that is getting to the coaches - it's the kids and their actions."

Montagnano through scrimmages with winning ball clubs has attempted to keep his kids tuned for what lies ahead, Northville this Friday, Ann Arbor Huron on Saturday, Plymouth Canton and Waterford Mott in the regular season finale and then comes the state tourney.

Against Walled Lake, Churchill scored eight points the first five times it went down court and led after one quarter, 16-10.

## Salem dumps Belleville

True basketball aficionados are beginning to sense that there's a lot more behind Plymouth Salem's 13-2 record than the Rocks' vaunted height and an offense which shows three men averaging double figures.

Pretty much overlooked has been Plymouth's team defense which showed itself again as the Rocks trounced Belleville, 77-51, to continue on top of the Suburban Eight standings with an 8-1 mark.

This was the 12th time in

15 games that Plymouth had held its foe to 50 points or less, the three exceptions all coming before 6-6 sophomore Jim Ellinghausen became a starter. The youngster's feather scoring touch has overshadowed what he has added to the club defensively, but the book puts it in vivid figures.

Plymouth's 77-point explosion against Belleville, paced by 6-9 junior Eric Agardy's 24 points, was the 12th time the Rocks had scored somewhere from 50 to 85 points. Season averages now show Agardy with a 15.7 mark, Ellinghausen 14.2 and guard Dave Praeter 10.5. In addition, Capt. Bruce Johnson has hit double figures in eight games and carries a 9.5 average.

The Rocks ran off and hid from Belleville as they piled up a 22-6 lead over the Tigers in the first seven minutes of

play, a pair of late Tiger buckets cutting the first quarter count to 22-10.

Eight second period points from Agardy helped make it 36-23 by halftime, and the giant tossed in 10 more in the third stanza as the Rocks boosted their lead to 56-37 at the three-quarter pole. Coach Fred Thomann cleared his 14-man bench in the final quarter as the Rocks added 21 more to Belleville's 14.

Four of the nine men who scored for Plymouth were in double figures (Agardy 24, Johnson 13, and Ellinghausen and Danny Moore 11 each), as the Rocks hit 32 of 73 from the floor for 44 per cent. Robin Hook and Narvell Turner paced the Tigers, each with 12 points, but as a team they connected on only 19 of 64 shots for 30 per cent.

Plymouth had the rebounding edge, 49-34, Ellinghausen getting 15 and Agardy 12.

However, in justice to Belleville, the Tigers were without six players - three of them starters - when they hung a 63-56 defeat on Plymouth on their own court in December. That upset was the only league loss the Rocks have suffered.

Belleville Coach Tom Niemi, in his first year there after serving as a Livonia

Franklin assistant, bounced the six for disciplinary reasons - one of which was being poked in the kisser himself by a player during a locker room altercation.

In Niemi's rebuilding he has even put the former student manager in uniform, and good morale and discipline have been established even though Niemi knows it may have cost a few victories.

The weekend's action left the Sub 8 reading: Plymouth 8-1, Edsel Ford 7-2, Dearborn 6-3, Allen Park 5-4, Livonia Bentley 4-5, Redford Union 3-4, Belleville 2-7 and Trenton 1-8. A full four-game slate was scheduled within the league Tuesday night and Friday it will be Plymouth at Allen Park, RU at Edsel Ford, Trenton at Bentley and Belleville at Dearborn. All teams play 14 league games.

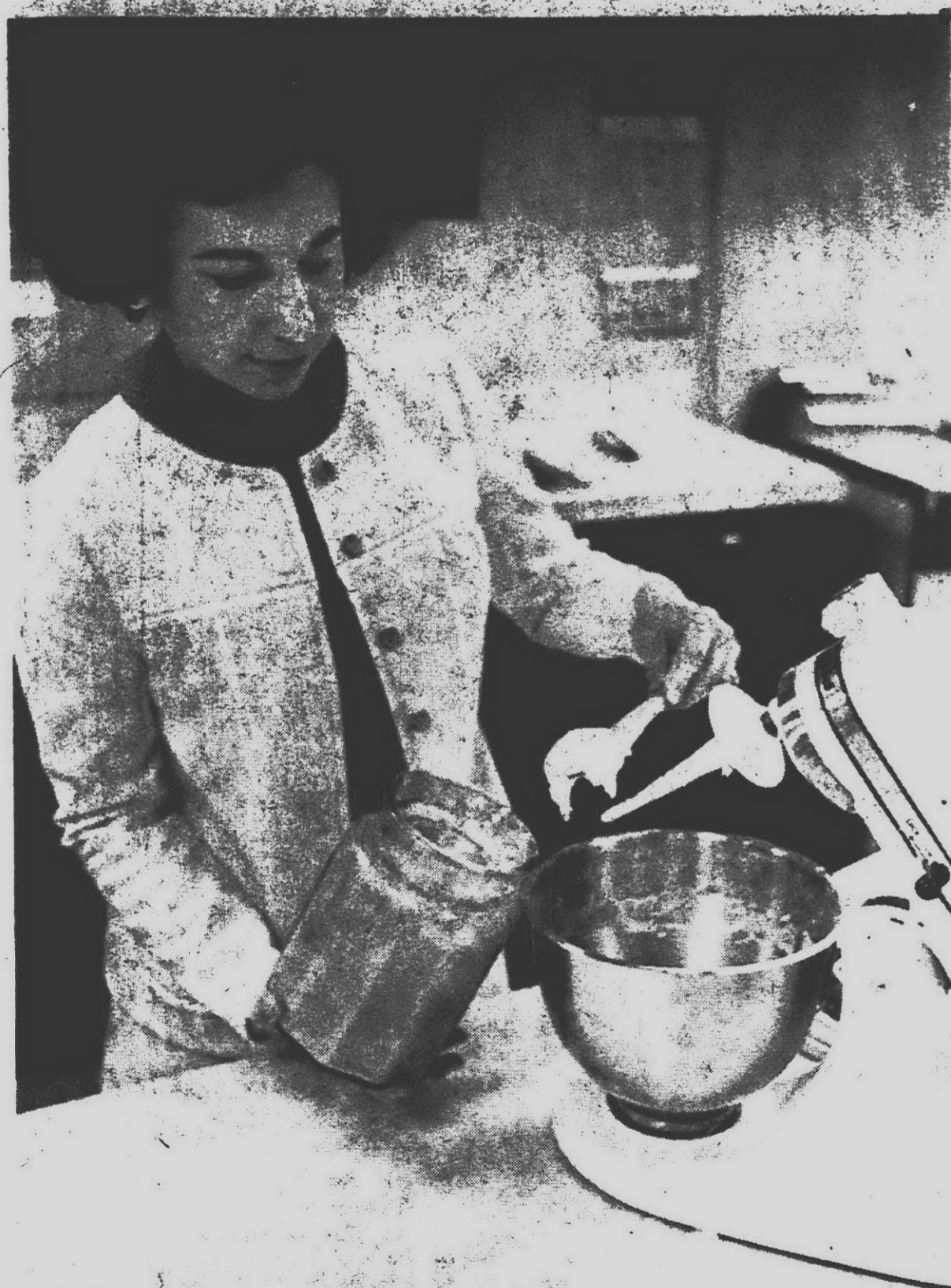

# Bake your own bread for only 15 cents a loaf

BY MARGARET MILLER

In these days of high prices, how does a loaf of bread for about 15 cents strike your budget?

You can have it for your family if you bake your own from the sour dough recipe that provided life - sustaining bread for the Gold Rush miners in California more than a century ago.

That kind of crusty bread uses only flour and milk and a bit of salt, said Mrs. Nell Benedict, who is demonstrating bread - making this week for Kitchen Glamor, Redford Township store that handles ingredients and utensils for all kinds of kitchen arts.

But sour dough bread does need a starter and 24 hours of rising time, Mrs. Benedict pointed out. If you want to speed things up a bit, you add yeast to the dough and a couple of cents to the price per loaf.

Rye and wholewheat bread also average about a nickel more per loaf because the flour costs more.

"But even with the price of flour so high these days," said Mrs. Toula Patsalis, a Livonian who operates the store with her husband, Christopher, "it's a lot more economical to bake your own."

"I do it for the love of bak-

ing," agreed Mrs. Benedict, "but it does cost far less. Last week I bought sour dough bread on sale for 69 cents."

Sour dough, whole grain and flat Arabic breads are among the stars of three shows a day this week in the Redford store, located at 26770 Grand River between Inkster and Beech - Daly.

The shows and demonstrations by Mrs. Benedict are at 9:30 and 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. Friday evening there will be a 7 p.m. seminar.

All are free, and those participating will receive a book of easy yeast recipes prepared by the Fleischmann Yeast Co.

Mrs. Benedict will demonstrate bread - making both with the use of a new, high - power mixer equipped with a kneading hook and by the time - honored hand - kneading method.

She will go into the history of sour dough bread as well as techniques for its present day production.

"We don't know just how old the method is," Mrs. Benedict said, "but we know that in this country it started with the Gold Rush. The starter dough was a valuable possession for the miners."

To make the starter, she said, you leave milk at room temperature for at least 24 hours, stirring it occasionally as it starts to thicken.

"After 24 hours put in an equal amount of flour," she said, "and stir it a couple of times a day for five days."

Then it's ready to use for bread, she said, but the loaves have to rise for 24 hours.

"We'll fudge a bit and use yeast in the baking for the demonstrations," Mrs. Benedict added. At Kitchen Glamor and in her home, starter dough is kept on the shelf and stirred a couple of times a day. When some is

used for bread, new flour and milk are added to the starter.

"Sour dough bread should have a golden crust and a tangy taste," the demonstrator said. "It's been a trademark of the San Francisco area for a long time, and now people all over the country are getting better acquainted with it."

Arabic bread is another unusual bread that will be demonstrated.

"This is a flat bread that people in the Arabic countries use as a scoop for their food," Mrs. Benedict said. "It has a sort of pocket in the center that makes it good for eating that way."

Mrs. Benedict also will point out good recipes for dark breads and show some fancy sandwiches she makes using light and dark breads and some white bread tinted pink and green with food color added at the mixing stage.

She will demonstrate use of a Pullman loaf pan, a special pan with a cover to give a loaf of bread a squared off shape.

Mr. and Mrs. Patsalis have recently been importing these pans from England because they were unable to find them in this country.

"We recently shipped two of the pans to Julia Child for her television shows," Mrs. Patsalis said.

My aunt, who stores in beautiful order a lifetime of treasures and memories, recently shared with me this memento of a bygone St. Valentine's Day.

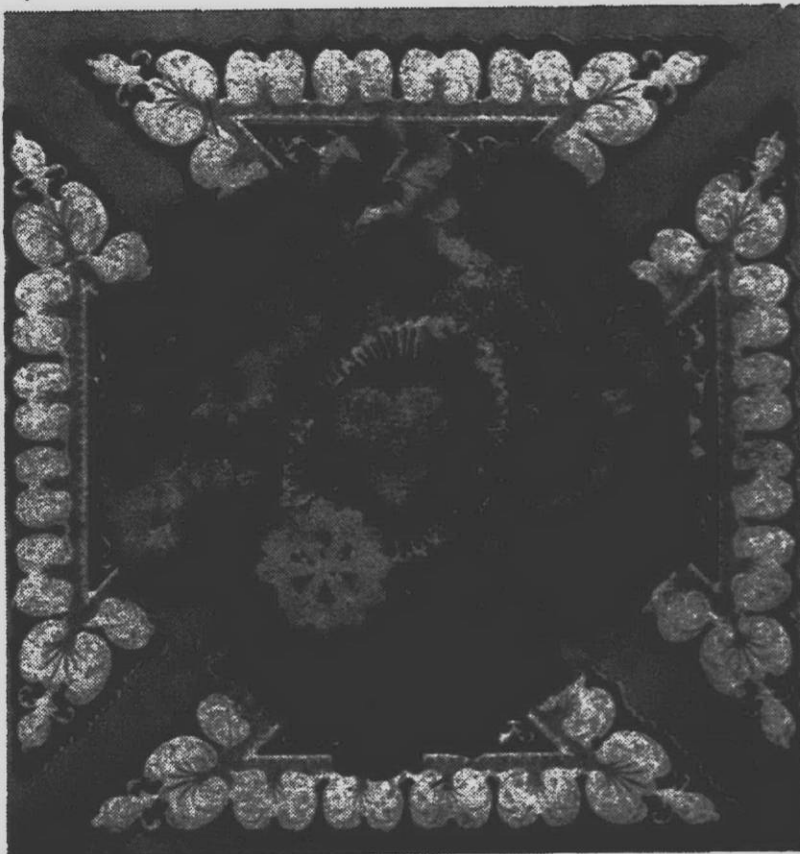

# Redford's Selma Goode is 'heart of gold' winner

Women hear consumer talk

Mrs. Selma Goode, a Redford Township divorcee who organized ADC recipients into the West Side Mothers, is winner of one of 12 "heart of gold" awards for 1974.

Mrs. Goode and 11 other women received their heart of gold pendants and certificates during the seventh annual recognition luncheon held in Cobo Hall Tuesday under sponsorship of the United Foundation and the Heart of Gold Award Council.

The Redford mother of four and the other women also received special Spirit of Detroit medallions from Fred H. McIntyre, president of the Central Business District Association.

each year by individuals or organizations, and the recipients are selected by a panel of judges from the council.

Told about being selected for the award, Mrs. Goode commented that her work in connection with the West Side Mothers was a matter of action at "just the right historical moment."

It was Thanksgiving weekend in 1965, she said, when she visited a mother receiving Aid for Dependent Chil-

dren and "learned a whole new side of life."

Always interested in the problems of the disadvantaged and minority groups, she realized for the first time how staggering can be the problems of just existing - eating, clothing and sheltering a family without the support of a husband or father.

She suggested that the ADC mother she was visiting get together with other mothers in the same situation. The answer was that there had been some thought of such a club, and Mrs. Goode promised to help.

"We had been organized for two years before we knew there were comparable groups in other cities," she said.

The group she helped organize came before the National Welfare Rights Organization and representatives of West Side Mothers were among the few to be invited when that group held its first national convention.

Under the guidance of Mrs. Goode, West Side Mothers have been able to make themselves heard and thus

have improved the quality of their lives.

Working with them, she helps them understand confusing welfare rules and regulations and assists them with frustrating interviews and red tape she says they encounter.

"Many of our women are temporarily in poverty, just waiting for the time when their children are grown and they can go out and work," Mrs. Goode said.

The Greater Detroit Council of Pioneer Women will host Douglas Ross who will talk on consumer concerns Saturday, Feb. 16, at 1:30 p.m. in the home of Mimi Robbins, in Southfield.

Ross, who heads the Michigan Citizens Lobby, is the author of "Robert F. Kennedy - Apostle of Change" and co-author, with Neil Staebler, of "How to Argue With a Conservative." He has served as a legislative aid and is a doctoral candidate at Princeton in the field of political science.

## Cancer Foundation needs drivers

If you are a licensed driver with a car, your help is needed to drive cancer patients from their homes to various hospitals and clinics for treatment.

One of the free services the Michigan Cancer Foundation provides to cancer patients without transportation of their own is a ride to and from treatment centers.

Many of these trips are from suburban areas to the downtown Detroit Medical Center, or to clinics and hospitals outside Detroit.

The patients are self-sufficient except for their lack of transportation. Volunteer drivers may wait for the patient at the clinic or leave

the patient and come back when he has been treated.

Currently in western Wayne County there are about 50 active volunteer drivers. With approximately 100 trips per month being provided, the cost of gas and threat of rationing, many drivers are needed.

All patient driving is done in day time hours on weekdays only. Volunteer drivers are entitled to an income tax deduction of six cents per mile.

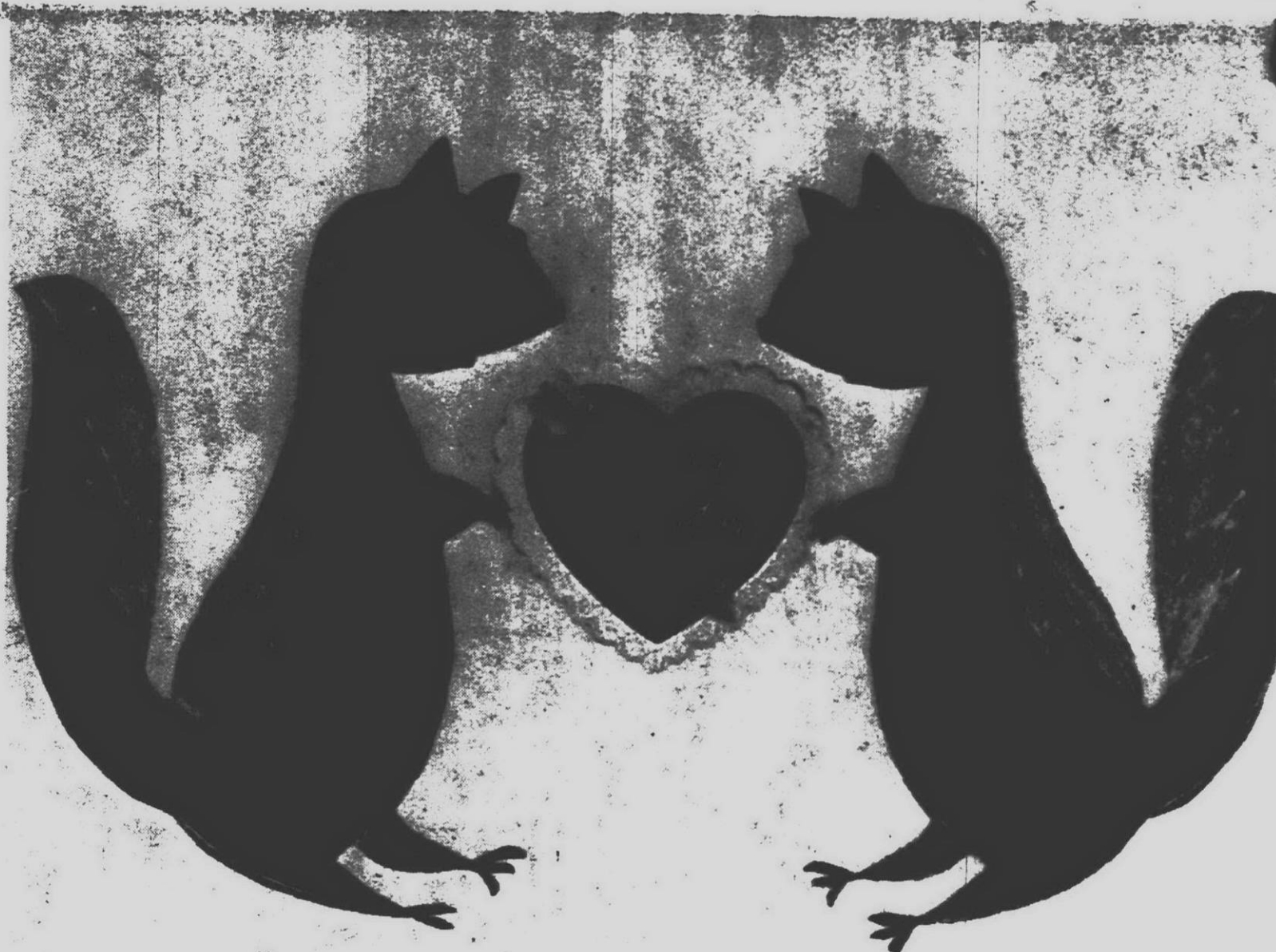

# Your tax \$\$ are lobbying for rezonings

Do you want your local taxes to go toward lobbying for rezoning the lot next door to show a factory there? Like it or not, they are.

The Plymouth - Canton Development Commission (PCDC) is totally supported by taxpayers of the city of Plymouth and Plymouth and Canton townships and the school district.

Each of those four governmental units contributes \$5,000 annually to make up the total budget of this quasi-governmental agency dedicated to "expanding the industrial and commercial tax base of the Plymouth Community School District."

Not that there's anything wrong with promoting non-residential tax base in our community - in fact it's a noble cause that makes us more economically sound in many ways.

But the PCDC sees that as including lobbying to get rezoning necessary for such industry or commerce to locate in the community.

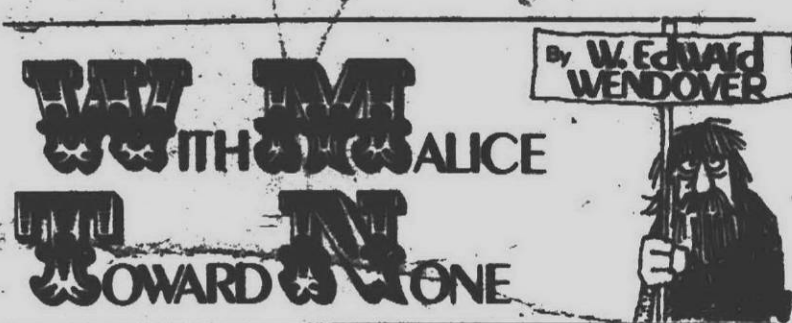
Or more specifically, the PCDC has been taking stands and lobbying for such rezonings and using our local tax dollars for that purpose.

Two times recently this came out.

James Houk, executive director of the PCDC, made a lengthy presentation before the Plymouth Township Board advocating rezoning the Burroughs Corp. parking lot to allow the commercial and high-rise residential development which has now been approved.

At the Mocerri Project public hearing, the PCDC board released a statement supporting the development which Houk said was made without regard for the project's proposed location but was based only on its tax potential.

Are we to assume the PCDC would therefore take a similar stand on building an iron foundry in Kellogg Park



or in Beacon Hills subdivision? Location is one of the prime factors that must be considered in rezoning property. Planning commissions must decide whether the proposed rezoning is proper for that location.

If the PCDC can't recognize that, why doesn't it just stay out of rezonings altogether?

Why should our tax dollars be used to lobby for rezonings? Shouldn't that be a responsibility of the developers?

Why doesn't the PCDC just issue a blanket statement supporting all rezonings that would allow commercial and industrial development if all it considers is the tax base issue?

Plymouth Township Supervisor J.D. McLaren said, "There's more room for understanding of their (PCDC) function than there now is."

"It's always been my understanding their (PCDC) prime function was to bring good industry to the area."

"I don't think that I ever really understood their position was one of lobbyist. I don't like that word," the supervisor said.

But it is just that word which describes the PCDC activity now under question. Should a quasi-governmental agency supported entirely by our tax dollars, lend support to proposed rezoning?

Russell Ash, a Plymouth Township trustee and former chairman of the planning commission there, countered the question saying, because a project is endorsed by the

PCDC, it isn't necessarily going to be approved by the local governmental planning commission or the governmental board.

That's true, of course. But why should our tax dollars be used to imply any amount of governmental support for a rezoning? It looks particularly suspicious when the PCDC backs some proposals but not others. Why?

Both Houk and Frank Millington, a Plymouth Township trustee and chairman of the PCDC, defended the agency's role in lending support to the projects.

They argued the PCDC would be leaving developers "stranded" after getting them interested in the area without seeing them through the rezoning.

"It would be foolish to spend a lot of time with people and then do nothing to help them," Millington said.

"I think we should take a stand on rezonings, absolutely. Otherwise, we're just wasting our time."

"If you're given a job to do, go ahead and do it," Millington emphasized several times.

"If you don't take a position, what good is having this office?" Houk said. "Frankly, if I've got to sit here and not do anything, they can have this job."

The PCDC can do a lot for our area by attracting potential developers and acting as a liaison between them and landowners.

But when it comes time for our four governmental units to re-ante for the PCDC, the practice of that agency's practice of lobbying and supporting rezonings should be evaluated.

Is that a proper use of the local tax dollar? Is it a proper function?

## The Stroller:

### You think it's bad here

So you don't like daylight saving time.

You dislike getting up in the dark and starting for work before the sun is up. The soaring gasoline prices upset you - even when it is available. And the cost of meat sends you into tantrums, to say nothing of the feeling that comes over you with the mere thought that bread could be selling for a dollar a loaf.

Well, don't let this energy crisis and all the side issues get you down. Things could be a lot worse.

How would you feel if you lived in England where the pinch really is being felt...where people are making all sorts of sacrifices...where they are working only three days a week

and, for the most part, in cold offices...and where meat has become a luxury?

How does The Stroller know about such things?

In the morning mail came a letter from a friend in Plymouth, England, who became acquainted with the Plymouth, Mich., delegation during our visit over there to help celebrate the 350th anniversary of the sailing of the Mayflower several years ago.

"Over here," she wrote, "after the initial period of increasing anxiety when ration books were issued, there were some days of panic buying when people were queuing up at the garages for a half gallon or even less to top up their tanks."

"Things are shaping up a little better now but those in the Southeast and the London area have been less fortunate, although supplies seem to be getting through, one way or another."

"It seemed rather odd that we should join the Common Market and then, as soon as trouble started, each country was for itself again."

Some idea of the sacrifices being made came to light when her letter continued: "Here we are having a three-day week, as such, but this affects primarily the people who work in the shops where large amounts of electricity are used for their machines as well as for light and heat."

"The offices are also being turned off for three days, so that if one is unfortunate enough to work in one it is comparatively dark and freezing and extremely uncomfortable. Even the hairdressers are only able to work mornings one week and afternoons the next."

"No wonder the emigration rate to Australia has doubled!"

If you think conditions are rough here and you have trouble shopping, listen to our friend as she continues: "The sales are on in the shops now and of course, it is very difficult to work and to shop with no lights on, unless the shop possesses its own generator. Even then the lighting is poor and one certainly could not hope to match colours or anything like that."

"Meat is so expensive over here that we scarcely have it, except in pie (beef and kidney pie) or in sausages. And it is surprising that one doesn't miss it. Everything is being changed by the rise in prices."

In every dark cloud, they say, there's a silver lining, and this is true at the moment in Plymouth, England, according to our friend who concludes: "Have you had much rain? We have had a tremendous amount and the roads and rivers have been full to the brim. It has been rather mild, and so defeated the coal miners' efforts to make us freeze."

And we think we have it tough over here in Michigan with the wind and snow to go along with the energy crisis.

There's a semblance of truth in the old saying that nothing is so bad it couldn't be worse.

# McNamara cold to 2nd District Esch fight

The political picture in the 2nd Congressional District became a bit blurred this week when Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara announced his decision against seeking the Democratic nomination to face U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch, the Republican incumbent from Ann Arbor, in the fall election.

Considered a strong candidate had he chosen to run, McNamara has caused considerable confusion as the field of potential candidates includes John Reuther and Marjorie Lansing, both of Ann Arbor; Ron Elsnor, of Ypsilanti, and Bruce Neal of Ann Arbor, a 1970 candidate who lost out in the primary to Michael Stillwagon.

"I have about 30 projects going in Livonia," the mayor said, "and I don't think it would be wise to leave them hanging at this time. Furthermore, because I still have two sons of school age I don't think it would be fair to them to pull stakes and leave Livonia for the national capital."

McNamara's withdrawal has changed the entire pic-

ture. Many of those wise in the ways of politics figured that he and Reuther, a nephew of the late Walter Reuther, would have cut each other up and open the way for Mrs. Lansing to win.

Now, with McNamara out of the race, it could be a wild scramble with Reuther and Mrs. Lansing as the early favorites.

Since his failure in the 1970 race for lieutenant governor as a teammate of Sander Levin, McNamara has spearheaded many projects in Livonia that he now would like to see come into being.

Chief among them are the building of a new administration building (a city hall), the loop road at Five Mile and Farmington Road; the Seven Mile - Wayne Road park, the Sheldon Park site; the beautification of Plymouth Road, senior citizens housing at Five Mile and Brookfield, the enlargement of Quaker Acres, establishment of bus service, cable TV and the completion of the Civic Center.

"I'm afraid if I would leave here now," he said, "these projects, or many of them, would fall by the

wayside. And I sure wouldn't want that to happen."

"Too many people in our city government have been so loyal and dedicated that it wouldn't be fair to them either."

As he scanned the list again with a smile of pride for the work done thus far, the mayor said:

"My decision not to run this time doesn't mean that I won't try for the nomination two years from now. The picture could change a great deal by then."

## New work planned on I-96

LANSING — Kensington Corp. of Novi and Greenfield Construction Co. of Livonia were lowest of five bidders with a joint bid of \$9,874,783 for 2.3 miles of work on Interstate 96 Freeway in Livonia, the Department of State Highways and Transportation announced.

The project, between Newburgh Road and Farmington Road, includes earthwork, grading and drainage structures on north-south Interstate 275 Freeway near the city of Wayne. Earth excavation from I-96 will be available for fill on I-275 nearby.

The project was among 10 highway construction and maintenance projects on which bids were taken recently in Lansing. Seven involve construction on I-275 and I-96 in Oakland and Wayne counties.

L. W. Edison Co. of Grand Rapids was lowest of six bidders at \$6,507,208 for earthwork, grading and drainage structures on 4.6 miles of I-275 between Sibley Road and a point near Romulus.

John Carlo Inc. of Mount Clemens was lowest of seven bidders at \$6,955,000 for earthwork, grading and drainage structures on 2.4 miles of I-96 and I-275 from Six Mile Road to Eight Mile Road in Livonia.

Walter Toebe & Co. of Wixom was low bidder on four separate projects for construction of I-275 and I-96 in Livonia, Canton Township and in Huron and Romulus Townships.

Included will be construction of 12 bridges to carry surface streets over I-96, now under construction, in Livonia. Bridges will carry Yale Avenue, Newburgh, Levan, Stark, Farmington and Wayne Roads over the freeway.

In addition, two bridges at Levan Road and two at Farmington Road will carry left-turn traffic from both roads over the freeway. Two other bridges at Newburgh Road will carry both left turns and U-turn traffic over the freeway.

Included, too, will be construction of six bridges to carry I-275 over the Lower Rouge River and Michigan Avenue in Canton Township. Still another phase of the Toebe contract will be construction of two bridges to carry northbound and southbound I-96 (also I-275) over Eight Mile Road and one bridge to carry Seven Mile Road over I-96 in Livonia.

Another set of bids will be taken in Lansing on Feb. 20, including one for the paving of 3.3 miles of I-275 in Livonia extending from Ford Road to Plymouth Road. Estimated cost of the paving is \$3.38 million with completion scheduled for November of this year.

Earthwork, grading and drainage structures on this portion of the freeway are already completed.

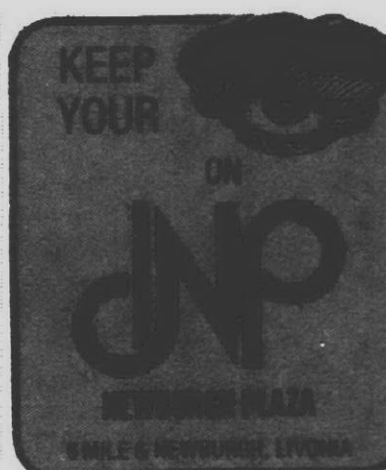

# Wayne-Westland still struggling

The secret of success seems to have eluded the Wayne-Westland Civic Theater as it struggles to remain in existence.

Theater President Fred Button of Livonia says he can't put his finger on the reason why the theater is doing so poorly.

"I can see other theater groups progressing and being accepted by the community, but we're not. If anyone has any answers, I'd be glad to hear them."

The Wayne-Westland Theater began 14 years ago. However, it has never had a permanent theater site, which Button says could be one of its problems.

At one time the group used the post office annex in Wayne, but it was torn down for urban renewal in 1965.

For the past five years it used the former Harvey School in Westland for rehearsals and set construction. Last summer the Wayne-Westland School Board decided to tear down the building to build homes. Once again it has left the theater out in the cold.

Through much inconvenience and difficulty, the group is now rehearsing in St. John Episcopal Church in Westland and using the Salvation Army building in Romulus for storage.

## leisure

Most of their plays are presented in John Glenn High School in Westland. However, the rental fee for the auditorium is \$450 to \$500 for a two-night performance.

This fee, combined with the cost of the production, often leaves the theater financially in the hole.

The last production, "Cyano," cost the theater \$1,600. Ticket sales amounted to only \$800.

"Our biggest problem is getting an audience, but I can't figure out why. We work hard putting on plays and I think we do a good job. But we just don't seem to be able to draw the people in."

Button says the group has tried offering the plays on different days, offering more performances, and all different types of plays. All to no avail.

"It's difficult to get up there on the stage when you've spent so much time on the play and worked hard to make it good, when only 50 or 60 people show up."

Besides a permanent theater site, Button says a greater interest in civic activities might help the group. "We send season tickets to school board members, city officers, including all council members and the mayor."

We're lucky if two or three of them show up during the entire season."

The group offers four performances per season — two full plays, a children's play and a night of one-acts.

"We usually help the Wayne-Westland PTA by splitting the box office sales of the children's play with them. But this year, even that took a beating."

The theater is presently \$1,000 in the hole.

"We're not trying to make money. We'd be happy just to break even."

Their next performance will be a night of one-acts Feb. 15 and 16, at 8 p.m. in St. John Episcopal Church, 555 S. Wayne Rd., Westland.

The one-acts to be presented are "Opening Night," "My Brother's Keeper," "Street of Good Friends," and "Slam the Door Softly." All are focused on the women's liberation movement during the period of the American Revolution.

The group currently has about 40 members. Officers are Button, president; Mildred Roy, vice president; Rita Urbaniak, secretary; Don McKee, treasurer; and Al LaCroix, business manager. Meetings are held the second Tuesday of every month and anyone is welcome.
