## Twp. trounces consolidation, city files annexation petitions

### Vote shows few area variations

Although it passed in the city of Plymouth, consolidation was overwhelmingly defeated by Plymouth Township voters in a light voter turnout Tuesday, according to unofficial results.

The precinct-by-precinct breakdown of the vote showed little variation in the city and in the township despite a massive phone campaign launched in the eastern polls (Lake Pointe area) of the township by consolidation backers.

Voters in the township cast 2,706 votes against consolidating with the city and 763 votes in favor. That total turnout represented 38 per cent of the 9,304 registered voters in the township.

In the city there were 658 votes cast in favor of consolidation and 252 against it, representing a total voter turnout of some 19 per cent.

To pass, consolidation would have had to have been approved by a majority of voters in each area.

On a percentage basis, the issue failed 78 to 22 in Plymouth Township but passed 77 to 23 in the city of Plymouth.

Last September, Plymouth Town-

ship put an advisory question on consolidation on a special election ballot with three other issues and it was defeated by a margin of 61 per cent to 39 per cent.

Tuesday's election was ordered by the Michigan State Boundary Commission which was acting on consolidation petitions filed in 1970 by Plymouth Township resident Dr. Gary Hall.

While the precinct-by-precinct results in both the city and the township showed some variation between areas, they did not reflect any sizeable differences in the township precincts canvassed heavily by consolidation backers led by Hall and Jim Jabara.

They organized a phone canvass which reached nearly all voters in Township Precincts 1, 2, 3 and 8 - the eastern and most heavily developed area of the township.

In addition, a helicopter trailing the message, "Vote for Unity" was hired by the Plymouth Police Officers' Association (police union) to fly mainly over the eastern portion of the township Tuesday.

The percentage breakdown for Pre-

### City eyes parts, all of township

PLYMOUTH-The polls had barely opened for Tuesday's consolidation election in the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township when the city filed petitions in Lansing seeking to annex the township.

In a surprise move at its meeting Monday night, the City Commission voted unanimously to file three annexation petitions with the State Boundary Commission seeking:

- In the first, to annex the Hillside Inn property on Plymouth Road to the city.

- In the second, to annex the Burroughs Corp. parking lot (across from the Hillside Inn) which has been approved by the township as a site for a commercial and residential development.

- In the third, to annex the entire township to the city.

The petitions were filed at 7:30 a.m. Tuesday - half an hour after the consolidation election polls had opened - with the boundary commission in Lansing by City Manager Fred Yockey and City Attorney Charles Lowe.

According to James Hyde, executive secretary of the boundary commission, the petitions will become active as soon as the board of canvassers' official results from Tuesday's consolidation election are filed in Lansing.

Within 220 days of that time, the boundary commission must determine whether the petitions are legally in order and then set a public hearing in or near the community.

The three petitions for annexation are not petitions derived from voter signatures but are the result only of the commission's action Monday night.

In the first two petitions, where the areas proposed to be annexed have

less than 100 residents in each, the boundary commission's decision on them is final. No vote can be called for by the residents.

Hyde said the first two petitions could be handled together since they do not entail conflicting areas.

The third petition, he added, must wait in line behind the other two.

Once the first two petitions are disposed of, the third would come before the boundary commission. If it is found to be legally sufficient and a public hearing is then held, the boundary commission must decide whether or not to order an annexation.

If the annexation of the entire township is approved, at least 30 days will be given for residents wishing to contest the decision to file petitions calling for an election on the matter.

Signatures of at least 25 per cent of the registered voters of a governmental unit are needed to mandate a vote but the election will be held only in the unit petitioning. However, if residents of both the city and the township meet the petition requirement, elections would be held in both areas.

Thus in the annexation drive, the opponents to such a move would have the responsibility of organizing a petition drive to overturn the boundary commission should it approve annexation.

It was this route which was recently taken by opponents to annexation in Northville and Northville Township. Those two communities defeated an annexation move last spring.

However, petitions have again been filed with the boundary commission to annex Northville Township to Northville and many believe the issue will pass this time.

The Northville-Northville Township

## Michigan Week is May 18-25

PLYMOUTH - Michigan Week will be celebrated in Plymouth with a program of events that runs the gamut from flapjack eating to a stylish art show.

Sandwiched in between, during the big week which opens on Saturday, May 18, there'll be a log rolling contest to carry us back to the old lumbering days, a visit from Grosse Pointe's mayor, John L. King, and several band concerts in Kellogg Park.

But for a conflict of dates there also would have been a full-fledged circus, wild animals and all, in the Cultural Center.

"We're still working on a few other activities," said Mrs. Don Sellers who shares the chairmanship of the week with her husband. "And we still have to hear from several of our organizations to find out what they may be doing."

The big week, designed to shout the praises of Michigan, will open with a civic program in the park on Saturday. Officially known as Community Pride Day, it will feature an address by Mayor Beverly McAninch and a band concert that is set for 1 p.m.

From then on there will be special events each day, with one of the highlights on Monday when the Grosse Pointe mayor will be the honored

guest at a civic luncheon and dinner at the Mayflower Hotel.

Beginning on Tuesday, the students at Plymouth-Canton High School will sponsor a three-day program with log rolling and burling contests scheduled at 2 p.m. On Wednesday the students will engage in a flapjack eating contest and on Thursday they'll join with the Plymouth-Salem High School students to present an historical program in which Frank Henderson, one of the area's most respected

elders, will be the main speaker.

The students conclude their portion of the big week with a tug of war on Friday. This will be a pull across the creek and is scheduled at 1 p.m.

While these events are going on, there'll be an art show in the Masonic Temple for three days, starting on Thursday.

One of the week's features will be a civic luncheon sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday in which the Wayne County Sheriff's

helicopter patrol will play a major role in explaining its activities in law enforcement throughout the area.

Along with these events there will be special programs during the week at the Hough-Dunning Library and the Historical Museum.

The celebration will close with a youth rally and flag raising ceremonies at Kellogg Park on Saturday at which the police and firemen will participate, at 1:30 p.m.

# DeHoCo inmates given skills which are needed by society

Next Friday afternoon, May 10, in one of the most unusual ceremonies of its kind, 18 women will graduate from the Schoolcraft College Child Care and Nurse Assistant Training Program.

The graduation is the first of its kind in the country because of the people involved. All 18 students are inmates of the Detroit House of Correction (DeHoCo) who for the past 22 weeks have been attending special classes and participating in on-the-job training at the Plymouth Center for Human Development.

The women have studied basic nursing techniques, anatomy, physiology, child psychology, learning theory and techniques of behavior modification.

They have worked on the wards at the center with the blind, physically handicapped, infirm and young ambulatory residents.

Many of the graduates will soon leave DeHoCo to take jobs in their hometowns, hospitals, day care centers and schools.

This is the first time in the country that a state prison, a community college and a training center for the mentally retarded all worked together in a program of training and rehabilitation.

So far, nine women have been granted special early paroles on the basis of their participation in the program which benefits both inmates and the retarded children. All nine will either take jobs in the community or

continue their education.

In addition, at least six more will re-enter society before the end of the year.

Graduation day will be one of both joys and sorrows for all involved with the program. The students will start in the morning saying goodbye to the hundreds of handicapped children whom they have cared for and in many cases, come to love.

At a 10 a.m. coffee supervisors and nurse attendants will join other center personnel in a farewell to the students.

Typical is the comment about the students from Mrs. Margie Patrick, supervisor in Carlson Hall which houses physically handicapped.

"You wouldn't know they were in DeHoCo unless someone told you. To me, they are another pair of hands to help. We always seem to be short staffed, but with trainees on a ward, our residents can have the attention they really need."

After a luncheon at the Dieter Recreation Building on the Plymouth Center grounds, the graduation ceremonies will be held.

Detroit Councilwoman Irma Henderson will be the guest speaker. She will be joined at the speaker's table by prison, college and civic authorities.

The program was conceived by John Amberger, DeHoCo superintendent, and William Womack, Plymouth Center superintendent.

The idea was to help rehabilitate women of DeHoCo and at the same time to provide an ongoing supply of highly trained and motivated persons who will enter the human care professions and especially to work with the mentally retarded.

Dr. Womack points out: "Those of us who work with the mentally retarded are familiar with the devastating effects of labeling people as retarded or as convicts rather than looking at them as human beings with individual characteristics, potentials and abilities."

The program is supported with funds from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration through a grant from the State Office of Criminal Justice. Schoolcraft College has contracted with the City of Detroit which administers the state prison for women, to conduct the training.

A registered nurse and a clinical psychologist serve as teachers on the Schoolcraft staff. In addition there is

a secretary for the program, a matron from DeHoCo, a counselor - job placement specialist and a program director.

The third partner in the program, Schoolcraft College, has been actively involved in rehabilitative training program for some years. The college considers DeHoCo residents to be within its service area.

All of the students have taken the Michigan and federal civil service tests for nurse assistants before graduating.

## Amberger named SEMCOG deputy

John M. Amberger of Plymouth has been appointed deputy director of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

Amberger joined SEMCOG Monday (May 6) after serving for the past two years as superintendent of the Detroit House of Correction (DeHoCo) in Plymouth Township.

Before that, he was an executive assistant to former Detroit Mayor Roman S. Gribbs and has some 15 years experience in Wayne County in various criminal justice and circuit court staff positions.

"Amberger's extensive administrative background in local and county government will be a valuable asset to the staff activities of SEMCOG," comments Michael Glusac, executive director of the regional planning agency.

As superintendent of DeHoCo, Amberger managed facilities for 900 inmates with a staff of 250 employees.

In his post with Gribbs from 1970-72, he coordinated activities between the mayor and the health department, Detroit General Hospital, Model Cities Program, Mayor's Committee for Hu-


man Resources Development, Detroit Youth Board, and the mayor's committees on drug and alcohol problems.

With Wayne County from 1955 - 70, Amberger served in several supervisory positions in the areas of probationer training, treatment and investigation and also served as a senior casework supervisor and a probation officer.

For several years, he has been active with SEMCOG as a member of the agency's Council on Criminal Justice. In 1969, he spent considerable time with SEMCOG developing a regional correctional plan.

Amberger, 43, has an undergraduate degree from and is a master's candidate in public administration at Wayne State University. He is married with two children.

SEMCOG is a voluntary association of local governments composed of elected officials from 94 communities in Southeast Michigan. Its principal function is to develop long range regional plans for transportation, solid waste removal, land use, housing, sewage disposal, recreation and open space, water supply and criminal justice.



# Educational Park plans graduation activities

PLYMOUTH - Details of graduation activities ranging from the senior prom to a commencement speaker were announced recently for graduating seniors at Plymouth - Salem High School.

Next year's seniors will participate in separate commencement ceremonies for Plymouth - Canton and Plymouth - Salem.

The senior prom will be held Saturday, May 18 at Eastern Michigan University's McKinney Ballroom. The event will run from 8 p.m. to midnight. Tickets are \$8.50 per couple.

The senior honors assembly is slated for May 23 at 7:30 p.m. in the

Plymouth - Salem High School auditorium. The program, for seniors and their invited guests, has been arranged by the seniors and their faculty advisors. Parents of students receiving recognition will be notified about a week in advance.

The Mayflower Meeting House is the tentative site of the senior banquet, scheduled for Wednesday, June 5 at 6:30 p.m. Tickets are \$6 per person.

Baccalaureate ceremonies will be held Sunday, June 9 at 2 p.m. in the Plymouth - Salem auditorium. Seniors will rehearse for the exercises Thursday, June 6, when they will re-

ceive their caps and gowns.

Attendance is optional with tickets to be issued at the rehearsal. Photographs are not permitted at the baccalaureate.

Graduation will be Wednesday, June 12 at 8 p.m. at Centennial Park football stadium. In case of inclement weather, exercises will be held in the Plymouth - Salem gym. Each senior will receive six tickets for guests on June 6.

Dr. Maurice A. Crane, professor of humanities and curator of the audio-voice library at Michigan State University, will speak at the commencement.

Dr. Crane is a specialist in communications skills. His articles have appeared in a number of professional journals and he has written poetry for the University College Quarterly.

Seniors may keep their caps, but gowns must be turned in immediately following the ceremony. Class colors are blue and white. The \$6 rental fee will be collected in Room 3000 at the high school during the first two weeks of May. A cap and gown is necessary for participation in graduation exercises.

Blank paper will be substituted for diplomas at the ceremony, with the real thing available when gowns are turned in.

Graduation rehearsal is 10 a.m. Wednesday, June 12 at the football stadium. Seniors are required to participate in both rehearsal and graduation and should park in the Canton lot for the rehearsal.

If a student is unable to attend the graduation, diplomas can be picked

up at the high school office during the summer.

Graduation announcements are expected soon and will be distributed by a representative of the Josten Co.

The senior party is set for the Plymouth - Salem recreation facility after commencement. The party is expected to run until approximately 3 a.m.

Mrs. Nancy Johnson and Mrs. Nan Cooper are co-chairmen of the event, which will cost about \$5 per student. The parent committee organizing the activities is still seeking stamp books for door prize use.

The party is open only to Plymouth - Salem graduates. Those who leave prior to the conclusion of the party will not be allowed back in.

The last day of school for seniors is Wednesday, June 5. Diplomas will be withheld if 15 credits are not clearly evident. Seniors who have not already done so should review their standing with their counselor as soon as possible.

pending annexation attempt was cited by the city commission as one reason for annexing the entire Plymouth Township to Plymouth.

Other reasons cited are: elimination of duplication of services, recognition of the city as being the social and economic focal point of the township and Plymouth Township's population growth "which historically has resulted in an increased demand for municipal type services."

Yockey said of the third petition (seeking annexation of the entire township), "If we got this, I think everybody would be happy."

He said the first two petitions (seeking annexation of two separate pieces of the township) were "not burnt offerings" intended to focus on the third petition.

The Hillside Inn (sought for annexation in Petition 1) is being sought because "in a way we're providing some of the essential services (for it)

just by our own existence," Yockey said.

The city surrounds the Hillside Inn on three sides and if the property across the street from it (sought for annexation in Petition 2) were annexed, it would be an island of the township surrounded by the city.

Yockey described the annexing of the Hillside as "straightening boundaries."

He said the land sought in Petition 2 would "allow the city some potential growth which is so vital to the city."

Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch said the annexation petitions were filed because the "city had to protect its right to growth."

She added that they were filed Tuesday because "time was of the essence if the city was to protect its interests."

Reacting to the city commission's filing of the annexation petitions while the consolidation election was taking place, Plymouth Township Clerk Helen Richardson said, "I think the timing was very poor."

"They have not acted in good faith toward the township" -- describing the city's action as "a good stunt which caught us off guard."

When the commission added the annexation petitions to their Monday night meeting agenda at the very end of the meeting, the press and members of the audience present were asked not to discuss the action until after Tuesday's consolidation election.

Yockey said, "We were hoping that it wouldn't be released before so that it wouldn't influence the election."

incts 1, 2, 3 and 8 show 29, 25, 23 and 22 per cent votes in favor of consolidation against the overall township average of 22 per cent in favor.

The strongest township precinct in favor of consolidation was Pct. 6 (west of Sheldon Road and between Ann Arbor Trail and Ann Arbor Road) with a 70-30 split.

Precinct 5 in the southwest portion of the township voted the strongest against consolidation -- 85 per cent opposed to 15 per cent in favor.

In the city, Precinct 3 (the north central area of the city), voted 80 per cent for consolidation and 20 per cent against. The other city precincts ran close to the 77 to 23 percentage overall outcome seen in the city.

Had Tuesday's election passed in both communities, a second election would have been held July 2 to elect charter commissioners who would have been charged with writing a new charter for the consolidated city. That election will not now be held.

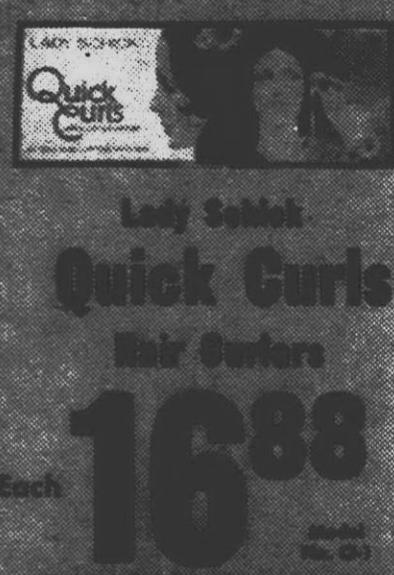

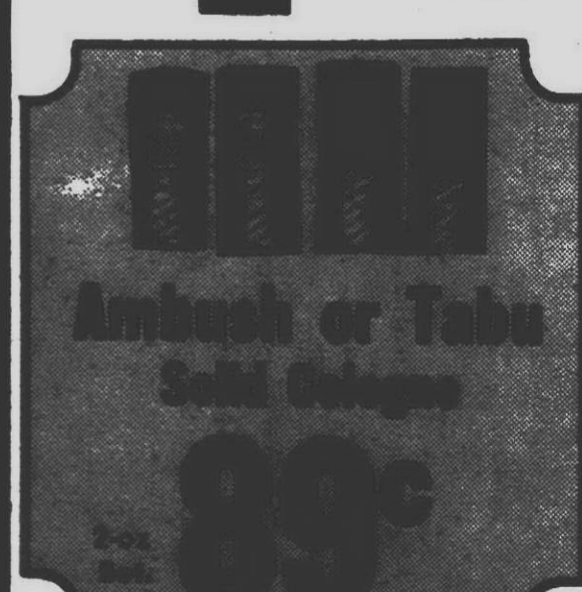

## Pollution definition sought to end country's 'hysteria'

As long as we have living things on earth we are going to have pollution.

With that terse statement Greg Dean, a Plymouth pollution consultant, leaned back in his chair and smiled at the present pollution "hysteria" gripping the country.

"I've been studying water problems for the past 20 years," he commented, "and I still don't know what pollution is and never have heard a good definition of the word."

"All I know," he continued, "is that it isn't anything new."

"There is the old Arabic legend, you know, that when Adam became exasperated with Eve he said to Allah, 'I don't know how to live with her and I can't live without her.'"

In his effort to find a definition for pollution, Dean called attention to many things that have puzzled him through the years.

He cited a case, about 10 years ago, when millions of fish died near a steel mill in Pennsylvania that had been draining its refuse into a stream.

"But this was during the winter," he said, "when the men were on strike. Now, what caused the fish to die? Was it the lack of warm water or was warm water the real pollution? No one is certain of the reason."

Another case that has him puzzled concerns the trout streams north of Lansing. The Michigan law states that nothing should be emptied into any of these streams that is more than five degrees above river temperature.

"That's fine," Dean explained, "except that the temperature of the Au Sable River is about 35 to 36 degrees in winter and the water residents draw from their wells is 50 degrees."

"Does that mean that this fresh water must be cooled before it dumped into the river?"

Then leaning forward in his chair Dean asked --

"Who says they must be designated as trout streams?"

Delving further into the current hysteria Dean said that this so-called pollution is the throwing off of waste. Then he asked-- "What would we do without it?" In support of his point he offers the explanation that plants throw off oxygen that humans need and we throw off carbohydrates that plants need. One can't live without the other.

Much of our trouble, according to Dean, is brought about by our excessive use of water during the past 150 years.

Once the land of seemingly unlimited resources, such as cheap land and free water, we now have reached the saturation point.

Much of the blame can be placed on the theory that water was the cheapest way to move things and provide transportation. It also was the easiest way to dispose of our human waste through sewer systems.

"Now we must find a new way of removing waste," Dean went on,

## Stempien won't run again against Esch

Marvin Stempien, former state legislator, has announced that he won't be a candidate in 1974 for U.S. Congress.

Stempien, a Livonia Democrat and attorney, was the 1972 Democratic nominee in the 2nd Congressional District which includes Livonia and Plymouth and parts of Washtenaw and Monroe counties.

There was a great deal of speculation from politicians from both parties that Stempien would seek the Democratic nomination in the 2nd District this year — the year of Watergate.

He was seen by many as the Democrat who would survive the primary and stand a good chance to unseat the Republican incumbent, Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor). In 1973, Stempien was defeated by Esch by six per cent of the vote cast.

In announcing his decision against the August primary this year, Stempien did say he was confident the Democratic nominee would defeat Esch in the November balloting.

"Family, business and other personal considerations require that I devote my primary attention to my family and business at this time," says Stempien.

"Our private polls indicate that the Democratic nominee will beat the incumbent representative in the 2nd Congressional District next November, so I will devote my political ef-

forts in 1974 to accomplish that end." Stempien cited a privately commissioned poll by a Detroit-based firm that shows present voter preferences

to be consistently 2-1 Democratic over the three counties of the district.

A former three-term representative serving Livonia and Northville, Stempien served two years as majority leader of the Michigan House. He is presently Democratic Party chairman of the Wayne 2nd Congressional District.

"I expect to remain active in Michigan politics and will run for re-election as Democratic party chairman of the 2nd District," Stempien added.

## Theo W. Williams files for Congress

Theo W. Williams of Ypsilanti has announced his candidacy for the Democratic nomination from the 2nd Congressional District.

Williams, a retired engineer and former factory worker, is the latest to announce candidacy in the August primary for the 2nd District which includes Livonia and Plymouth.

In announcing, Williams stressed

the need for more openness in government at all levels, noting the need for representation for everybody, not just special interests and the wealthy few.

Williams believes everyone should have access to their own government file, whether it be city, state or federal government records.

He noted the government's mismanagement of the energy crisis as a "shocking example of the Nixon crowd's bungling that is clearly apparent to any thinking person. Only last October the Arabs warned of an oil embargo, but Nixon did nothing, as he was spending his time trying to find a way out of the Watergate mess."

Williams expressed support for an intelligent military budget with fewer generals and admirals and an effective, economical military establishment.

### Stony Creek now rents boat storage

Stony Creek Metropark near Utica is now renting space in its boat storage area on land adjacent to the boat launching site.

Williams noted he had publicly challenged incumbent Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) as a "do nothing Congressman" in the 1972 campaign, claiming Esch made no positive denial of the accusation.

Williams is an overseas veteran of World War II, a graduate mechanical engineer from the University of Michigan in 1941, and a former president of the University of Michigan Club of Syracuse, N.Y. He attended schools in the Ypsilanti area, has lived in Ypsilanti for more than 20 years, and has been an engineer for more than 25 years.

He claims to have been active in protecting the right of privacy for more than 15 years. In 1967, he worked with the chairman of the congressional subcommittee on invasion of privacy.

## 1st code of ethics adopted

What is believed to be the first code of ethics for county officials in Michigan has been adopted by the Wayne County Commissioners.

The code was approved by a 15-2 vote, with one abstention, at a recent meeting of the board.

The code was recommended by a subcommittee which included commissioners Brian Arrowsmith (R - Canton Township) and Richard Manning (D - Redford). Arrowsmith chaired the subcommittee.

According to Arrowsmith, county codes of ethics exist only in Montgomery County, Md., and in Iowa.

Under the code, a five-member ethics commission will be established to investigate alleged violations and to report findings of guilt to the board of commissioners. Members will be appointed by the board chairman and confirmed by the board.

Violations will subject elected officials to public censure by a two-thirds vote of the 27-member board of commissioners. Appointed officials are subject to removal by majority vote of the board.

Appointed officials would be required to file a "full disclosure" of their sources of income at the time of

appointment and for the last year.

Financial disclosure isn't required of elected officials. The board's legal advisor told commissioners it doesn't have legal authority to impose that requirement on elected officials.

Corporation Counsel Aloysius Suchy said a 1970 legal opinion to that effect is still current. He noted, however, that a code of ethics for state employees now under consideration in the legislature might change that situation.

The new county code covers these areas of conflicts of interest:

Unauthorized divulgence of information for personal gain or the gain of others;

Arrangements for personal benefit based upon official position or authority or upon confidential information gained by reason of such position of authority; and,

Solicitation or acceptance of gifts, favors or "other profit arrangements" under any circumstances which tend to influence or have the appearance of influencing the manner in which an official performs his works, makes his decisions, or otherwise performs his work, makes his decisions, or otherwise performs his duties.

Members of the ethics commission will be appointed for staggered five-year terms with not more than three from the same political party. Proceedings of the commission will be confidential until a commission majority votes to submit a finding of guilt to the board of commissioners.

The commission will also have authority to order corrective or rectifying action on the part of an official or department, with failure to comply being grounds for action by the board of commissioners.

Adoption of a code of ethics was proposed last year by commissioners Samuel Turner (D - Detroit) and John Hertel (D - Harper Woods) who is now a state senator.

Turner is chairman of the board's general government committee which recommended the code be approved by the board.

The legal opinion that elected officials couldn't be made to disclose their incomes was rendered after Commissioner Paul Silver (D - Detroit) proposed in 1969 that all county officials be required to do so.

Silver, stating that attitudes have changed as a result of Watergate and other political scandals, argued that financial disclosure by elected officials should be included. He voted against adoption of the code of ethics because of that issue and because of the method of selecting members of the commission. "We will be picking our own judge and jury," he said.

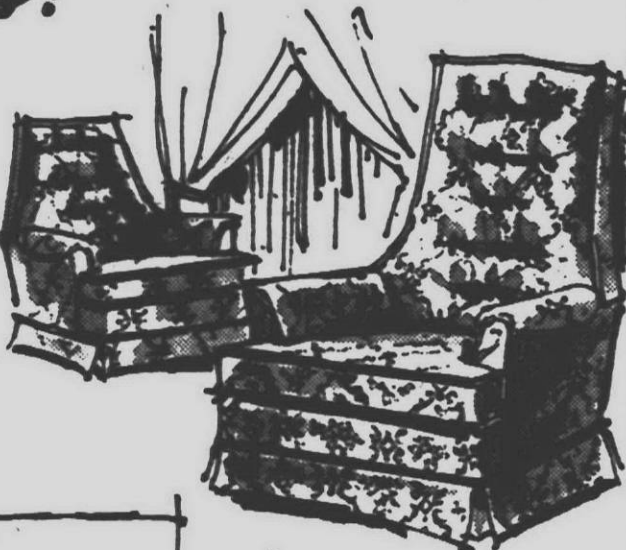

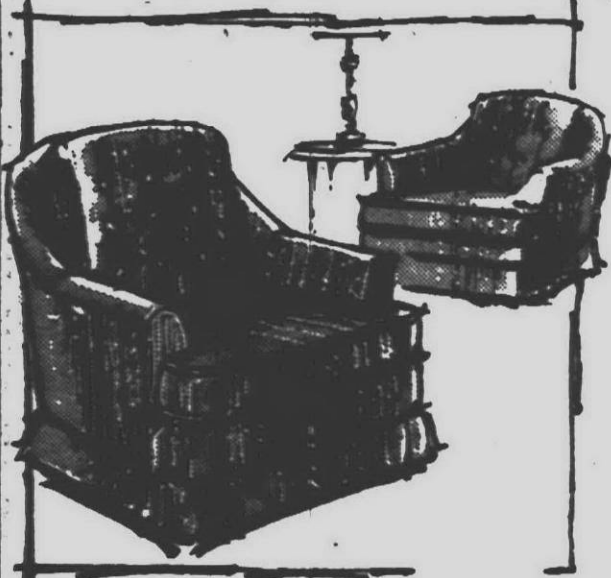

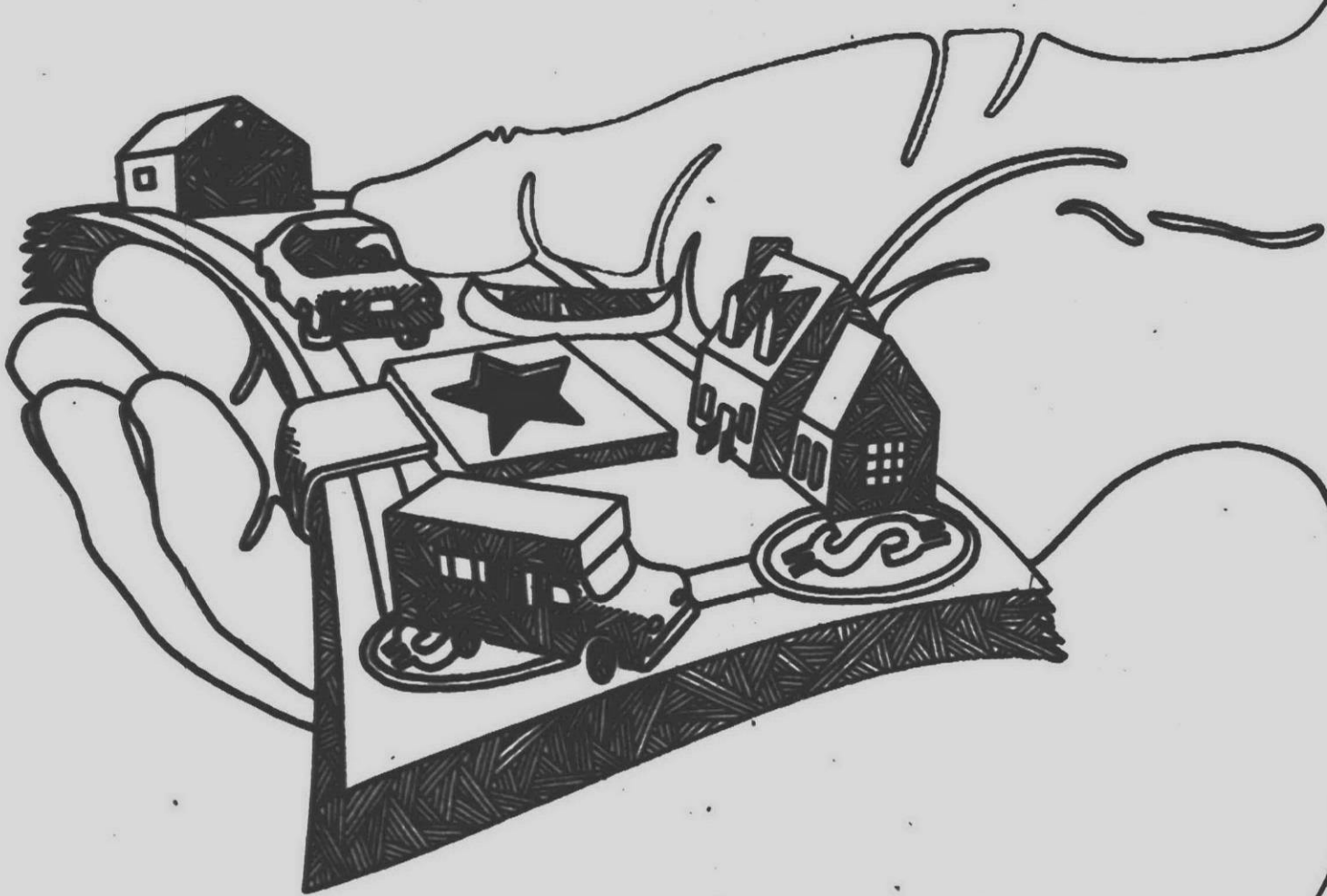

# The Stroller: Ingenuity will triumph

From the Atlantic to the Pacific and from Canada to the Gulf our institutions of higher learning are sending their graduates out into the business world this month.

Armed with their diplomas and memories of their college days they'll find that all is not peaches and cream when it comes to making a living in the highly competitive quest for a livelihood.

They're entering the nation's work force at a time when we are on what some economists call "the brink of a recession" and the rate of unemployment is higher than it has been in quite a spell.

So these young men and women are going to find that no favors are asked and none given. They'll find it is a case of the survival of the fittest — and only those with imagination and a healthy portion of American ingenuity will make the grade.

The present plight of the graduates reminds The Stroller of the advice the late "Boss" Kettering, head of the General Motors Research Department, gave to a young graduate in engineering.

We were seated in the locker room of a golf course in Dayton, Ohio, where "Boss" liked to spend his Saturday afternoons. A major tournament was in progress. But during a lull in play, the GM executive was holding court — always an enjoyable session.

Finally, one of the young engineers spoke up. "What you are telling us is fine, except that times have changed since you started."

"Here I am going out into the world when we have most of the things we need — wireless, TV, spacecraft, all sorts of aircraft and plenty of automation on every side. What is there for us young graduates to do?"

"Boss" looked up with that wry smile for which he was famous.

"Young man," he asked, "do you know why grass is green? Why isn't it some other color, say pink or red?"

The young engineer stood silent as he pondered the puzzling question.

"If you can find the reason for green grass," "Boss" went on, "you'll never have to worry about making a living. The door is always open to find new ways of doing things."

Another fine example of this American ingenuity comes to mind and it concerns two sons of the florist back home in the hills of Pennsylvania.

These two chaps graduated from different institutions and came home to the greenhouses to relax before starting to meet the challenge of eking out an existence.

Then they got an idea. They agreed that Dad wasn't aggressive enough and lacked the imagination to make a real success of the florist business.

They induced him to build a one

room brick building and furnish it as if it was a living room in a home.

"We can show the folks what the flowers will look like when they display them at home," the young lads explained. So the building was built — and became an instant success.

Then they got another idea — and this was most unusual.

If there is perpetual care of graves in our cemeteries, they reasoned, why not have a perpetual flower program?

No one ever had thought of that idea. So the young fellows tried it.

Under the program you could select as many days in the year you wanted to have a flower display on the graves of your loved ones — and pay annual

fee. They would see that the flowers were placed and an evergreen placed on the graves for the winter.

The novel idea struck the fancy of the folks, especially those who no longer lived in the old home town. There always was the fear of forgetting. That fear ended with the new program.

The last time The Stroller checked, the two young lads had built up a clientele of 350 customers for perpetual flower care and they needed a new building to store the flower boxes in the winter.

At \$35 per grave this gave them a guaranteed income each year of more than \$12,000 when they opened the

door on a new fiscal year. Their diplomas are now hanging on the wall as reminders of their college days — but nothing more than that. Their ingenuity paid off in another field.

This should be a lesson to the new grads now pouring out of our institutions of higher learning.

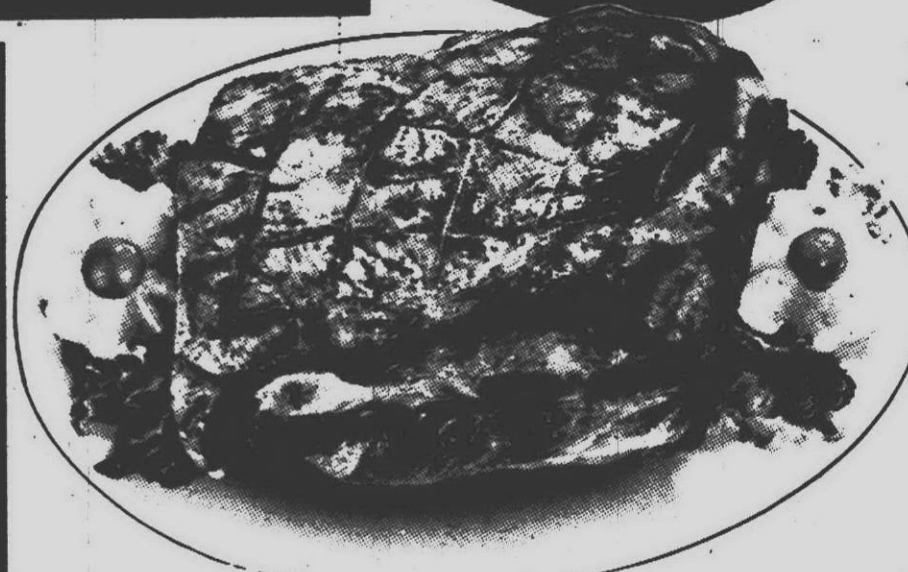

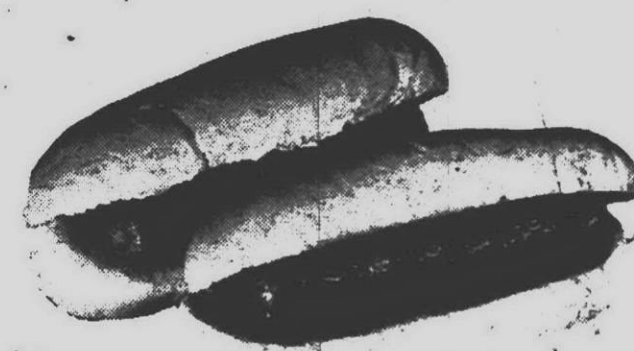

"without the use of so much water. But here again we come into a vicious triangle. We can drain the water waste and make it solid. Then, off to the incinerator where we burn it. But in burning it, we send fumes into the air and pollute that. To clear this we now have sky scrubbers that clean the air and send it right back to solid waste.

Warming up to his subject Dean pointed to the fact that solid waste can be put to good use. He cited the case of St. Louis where the burning of solid waste provides steam used to heat some of the civic buildings.

He cited another profitable case where a mirror manufacturer who had been discharging ground glass and lubricants into a lake discovered a way to recover diamond dust from the grinding wheels that was worth \$7,000 per pound.

Dean couldn't help smiling when he recalled that as far back as the 11th century the King of France placed a ban on dumping waste into the River Seine - and that the river still is far from clean today.

"And at one time in France," he recalled, "they placed vacuum cleaners in the poles being used to display posters to get the dust out of the air."

In a reminiscing mood he asked, "Would you believe that there was a time in Northern Germany when the manure pile in front of a home was status symbol?" It seemed the larger the pile the richer you were and the more cattle you owned."

There is some question in Dean's mind whether we don't use too much water.

"Over in England," he said, "water consumption averages about 50 gallons a day per person, while over here the amount climbs to about 250 gallons a day.

"This is because we use such things as dish washers, garbage disposals and that most of us take daily baths. Over there the English don't think a daily bath is necessary in that it tends to wash away the natural protection of the skin.

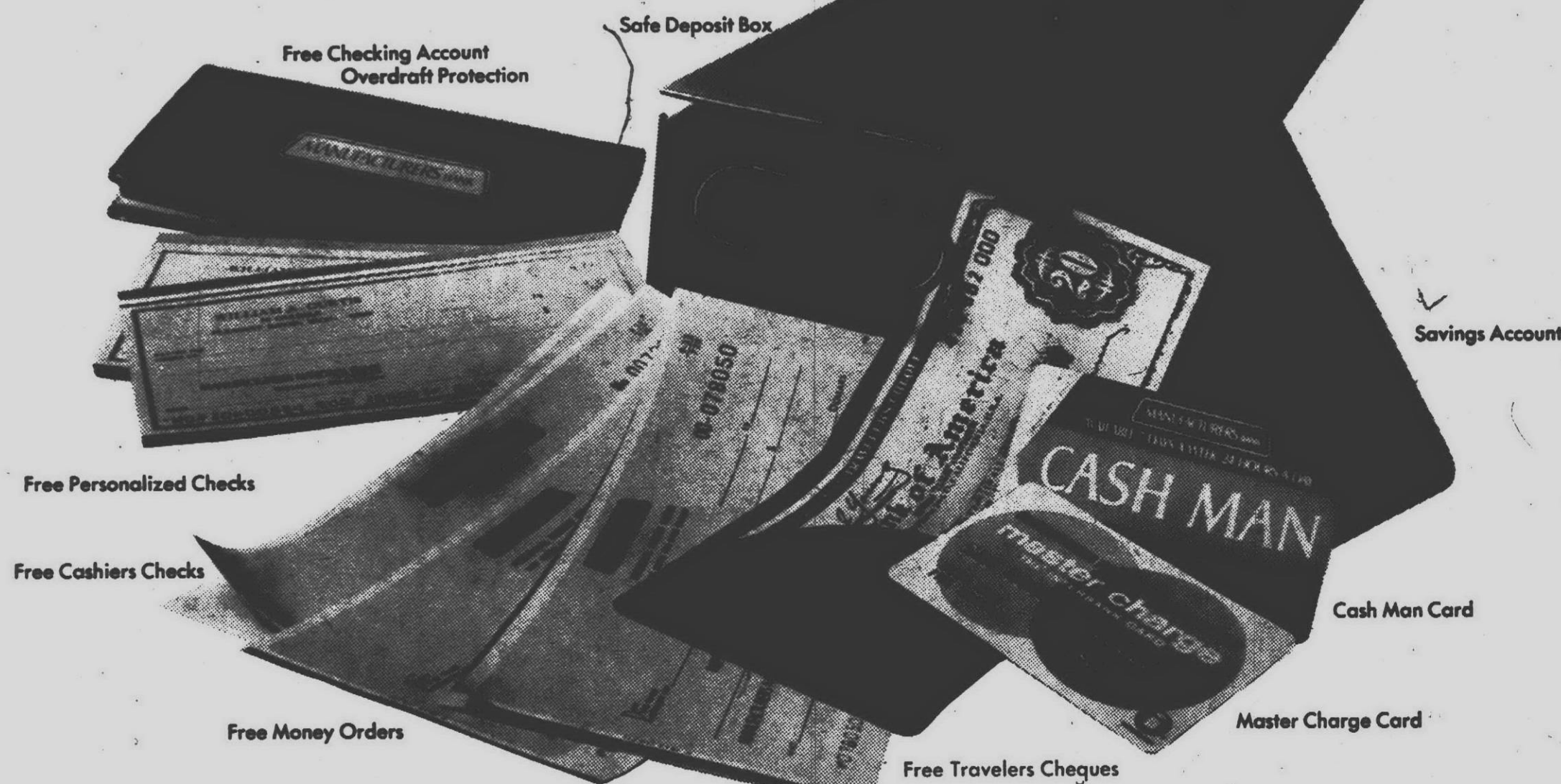
"And our advertising agencies are forever stressing the use of cosmetics and all sorts of soap powders, all of which use an abundance of water."

If there is any remedy for this so-called pollution, Dean said, it must come from the folks who cause the conditions. He says that Michigan doesn't have many rivers as they come from mountain springs. Instead most of the Michigan water comes from swamp lands.

So it is up to the companies and industrial plants to do the job. One company, he recalled, recovered from two to six gallons of oil a week by use of an oil skimmer.

Then, turning in his chair, he repeated "As long as there are living things on earth we'll have pollution problems."

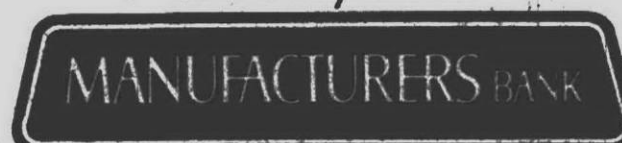

# State Legislature considers arts funding

Andrew Jackson once said, "There are no necessary evils in government. Its evils exist only in its abuses. If it would confine itself to equal protection, and, as Heaven does its rains, show its favors alike on the high and the low, the rich and the poor, it would be an unqualified blessing."

As in Jackson's day, governmental blessings these days are few and far between — especially unqualified ones.

But the Michigan Legislature has a chance to change that in the area of arts funding by showing its favors on the poor instead of the rich.

Too poor in this context represents the community arts councils, symphonies, theaters, museums and other local institutions and programs in the arts.

The rich represents major statewide art institutions and programs such as Cranbrook, Detroit Institute of Arts, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Interlochen, Meadow Brook Theater and Michigan Opera Theater.

Actually, these are the six institutions being considered for funds from the Michigan Council for the Arts for which Gov. Milliken recently recommended \$1,100,000.

Jim Hale, a staff member of the Michigan Council for the Arts, said the \$1,100,000 was established by the MCA arbitrarily. The six institutions were invited by the MCA to present proposals for funding according to MCA criteria.

The \$1,100,000 would be appropriated to the council from the general government substitute bill of the state budget for the coming year.

Out of \$90 million in the general government substitute bill, approximately \$1 to \$2 million is expected to go to arts, and possibly even less than \$1 million.

The governor's recommendation of \$1,100,000 must be approved by both houses of the Legislature before it goes to the floor for a final vote, a process which could take months.

In the meantime, the Joint Legislative Committee on the Arts is trying to determine where the funds, whatever they amount to, should be directed.

A series of public hearings as scheduled by the committee during the past week for feedback from local arts councils, theaters, symphonies, etc., on the appropriate direction of legislative action in support of art programs.

Chairing the committee is State

Sen. Jack Faxon (D - Detroit). Other committee members are State Senators William Ballenger (R - Lansing), David A. Plawewski (D - Dearborn Heights), Carl D. Pursell (R - Plymouth), State Representatives William R. Bryant Jr. (R - Grosse Pointe), Louis K. Cramton (R - Midland), H. Lynn Jondahl (D - E. Lansing) and Earl E. Nelson (D - Lansing).

The second of the three public hearings was held Friday in the Observer - Eccentric Newspaper offices in Livonia. Committee members present were Faxon, Pursell and Jondahl.

Among the audience were representatives from the Livonia, Midland, Dearborn and Ypsilanti Arts Councils, the Michigan Council for the Arts, the Detroit Institute of Arts, Music Hall Center for the Performing Arts and Chrysler Corporation.

Faxon opened the hearing by saying Livonia was chosen for one of the hearings because "we wanted you to see the cultural wasteland."

Speaking for the newly formed Livonia Arts Commission, Electra Stamelos decried Livonia as a "deprived community."

"Artrain is the first smattering of cultural arts we've had," Mrs. Stamelos said. "To most local residents, Detroit is a strange, dark, foreboding jungle. We've got to offer the arts on a local basis."

Mrs. Stamelos also stated that what the Legislature was proposing in terms of funding was "merely a drop in the bucket."

Dr. Frederick Cummings, director of the Detroit Institute of Arts, stressed a cooperative effort, rather than working in isolated units, indicating major institutions would share their benefits from the funds with local institutions.

"It's a matter of quality of programs," Dr. Cummings said. "You want them to be of a high level. Funds should be put in the hands of those who can provide quality programs."

Dr. Cummings also said participation in the arts was very important and shouldn't become another spectator sport.

A representative from the Midland Arts Council questioned whether local institutions would want programs offered by major institutions.

"A local symphony might not want the Detroit Symphony to come into its community. They might look upon it as competition. The attitude of the community has to be right."

Senator Pursell, favoring funding for local institutions, feels conflicts may develop if the Detroit Symphony gets funds, while the local community symphonies get nothing.

Pursell pointed out that it should be determined whether the Michigan Council for the Arts is doing its job in serving Livonia and other communities.

Schoolcraft College, which serves five different communities (Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville and Plymouth), needs a fine arts building. We lack the facilities in some of these communities to do the things we want to."

Although Pursell favored funding institutions individually throughout the state rather than through the MCA, he warned that if funding is voted on by the Legislature, "where the most votes are in the House and Senate is which communities will get the most funds."

Pursell also said the arts will still be competing for funds with everything else in the budget.

"You have to be reasonable about how you're going to develop the program. You have to realize there are budget limitations."

The representative for the Midland Arts Council said he had mixed feelings about the way funds were expended in the MCA.

"The key issue is the philosophy of the council itself. It's never really been clear and it needs an answer."

Sen. Faxon said the MCA was originally designed as an agency to funnel funds from the state to community arts councils.

A representative for Chrysler Corporation said the business sector had supported every one of the major institutions in varying amounts, stating Chrysler had supported all six (of those specified in the report) in amounts of up to \$50,000.

"They all need money. The support of major art institutions is good in other states, not so in Michigan."

He continued that the proposal (funding of the six major art institutions) was one of the best things to ever come along, but that he would hate to see a lot of bickering about who gets how much.

"The Legislature should make the decision as to how much each organization gets, rather than throwing it into the arts council for everyone to fight over."

Sen. Jondahl said he couldn't promise there would be any less bickering in the Legislature than in the arts council.

The group's last fund-raiser for the trip to Europe this summer will be a music marathon Friday, May 17, in Frost Junior High School, 14041 Stark Road. Tudors will collect pledges to see how long they can keep the music going.

The marathon will continue Saturday, May 18, with a pancake breakfast at 8 a.m. The music is planned to continue to midnight.

Local music groups will be invited to attend. Booths at the marathon will feature food, games, crafts, candy, T-shirts, volleyball and basketball tournaments, cartoon movies and a "dunk your favorite teacher" booth.

Plans for the European tour this summer have been completed, with 38 students of the Tudor Concert Tour participating.

Their first stop will be in Switzerland on June 25, where a concert will be given. Other stops and concert performances include Austria and Germany.

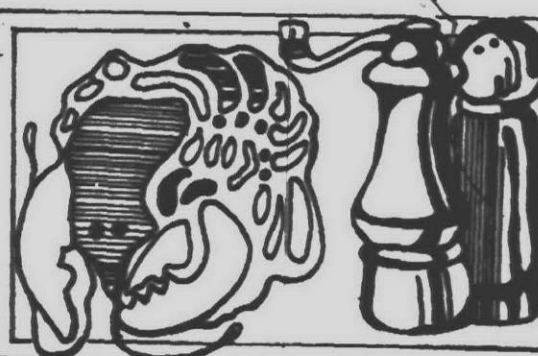

# Liquor license trap sprung to generate local revenue

What does a growing community do when it has five applications for liquor licenses and the state will only allow them to give out two more because its quota will be filled?

In all probability, that community will give the licenses to the applicants whose establishments will bring in the most tax revenue to the community — the bigger the operation, the better its chances.

If that doesn't seem quite fair, consider the position in which the state has put those communities. Under the law, a municipality is allowed only one liquor license for each 1,500 residents, based on the most recent census count.

Now, if a community has grown considerably since the last census in 1970, there may be a heavy demand for the few licenses that it is allowed to dispense. Yet, the community's license allotment will not be changed until the next census in 1980.

In the meantime, developers who cannot get licenses will take their proposed establishments elsewhere. It only makes sense to give the remaining licenses to the biggest and most influential of those.

However, at least for the smaller of the rapidly growing communities in the state — like Plymouth, Plymouth Township and Canton Township — relief from those state strictures may be in sight.

A state law recently passed in the legislature will allow those communities to take a special census to determine the rise in population that will permit them to raise the license quota prior to 1980.

Public Act 58 provides that "a special state census of a local governmental unit may be taken at the expense of the local governmental unit by the secretary of state . . . and shall be initiated by resolution of the governing body of the local governmental unit involved."

That law could mean quite a bit of additional tax money in the coffers of area municipalities and added convenience to members of those communities.

Most recently, in Canton Township the township board of trustees dis-

persed that community's last two Class C liquor licenses to developers of a big bowling center and a restaurant-bar-motel complex. Trustees were nervous about that decision, and one township trustee noted that he hoped the decision "will not come back to haunt us."

The trustees, however, had the new law in mind when they granted their last licenses. Township Clerk John Flodin had already written the secretary of state requesting information on how to go about conducting the special census.

According to the elections division of the secretary of state's office in Lansing, the township will have to pass a resolution asking permission to conduct a census. The elections division will then be asked to approve that request, and the township may proceed to conduct its census.

Cost figures for the census are unclear, Lansing sources say, because the figures depend on the amount paid to the census takers. Some communities, they say, may be able to conduct the census for next to nothing by working with volunteer labor (such as the local chamber of commerce or other civic organizations); others may elect to hire census workers for negotiable wages.

The costs for such census, the elections division says, could be anywhere from four cents to 25 cents per person. Assuming the highest cost, Canton Township might then expect to pay upwards of \$2,750 — not an unreasonable cost considering the tax benefit of the license increase.

In the city of Plymouth, too, (where the 1970 population was 11,758 — only slightly higher than Canton Township) such a course of action may be feasible.

Currently, of a total of eight licenses, all but two have been dispensed, and one of those has reportedly been committed to a local developer.

In Plymouth Township, with a 1970 population of 17,479, eight of 12 licenses have been given out.

Most of the area's larger communities have yet to come very close to using up their quotas of licenses. Livonia, for instance, is allotted a total of 74 licenses and has used only 49 of them.

Garden City, allowed 28 licenses, still has "seven or eight" remaining.

In Westland, about 20 of that city's 58 allotted licenses remain.

In Redford Township, of 48 allotted licenses few remain to be issued.

Perhaps, however, even those communities will find that rapid growth in the next few years will find them at the limits of their allotments. In the

largest cities, census costs of perhaps more than 25,000 might make things a bit difficult. But even there, tax receipts may well offset costs.

The new law seems to be workable

for most communities, but the exact procedures will have to be worked out with the elections division of the state. Canton Township may be a good test case.

The arrest of a Wayne man has cleared the armed robberies of four party stores, a market, and two savings and loan offices in western Wayne County, Westland police reported.

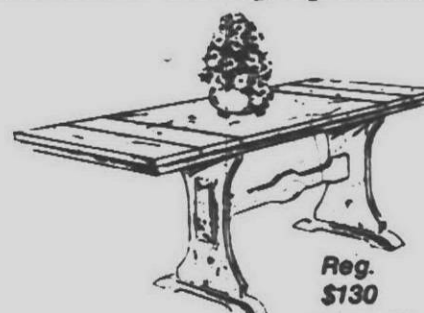
The officers said Charles Jones, 29, admitted the robberies and will be given a federal court hearing on robbing the savings and loan offices on May 13.

## Defending poor costs \$3.5 million annually to county

The cost to Wayne County taxpayers of providing legal counsel for indigent persons charged in Recorder's Court and Wayne Circuit Court has reached \$3.5 million annually.

That report was made recently by Robert E. FitzPatrick, chairman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners, to a subcommittee of the State Senate Committee on Judiciary.

FitzPatrick appeared before the subcommittee to urge that it investigate the problem and suggest solutions. He charged that procedures for determining indigency in Recorder's Court are inadequate.

The expense has grown since the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that courts must appoint counsel for poor persons unable to hire their own attorneys. That ruling extended the requirement of court-appointed counsel to misdemeanor as well as felony defendants.

"The right of every individual to counsel and the obligation of the government to provide this counsel aren't

## Fire training starts May 12

Firefighters who work on the rotating "Kelly System" and go to college on their off days will be attending a Sunday course at Madonna College in Livonia starting May 12 or May 18.

Municipal Fire Administration, in-service training for fire chiefs, command officers and firefighters, will be taught in identical back-to-back three-hour sessions on Saturdays and Sundays for five weeks.

Each enrolled fireman will be allowed to attend the session each week which falls on his day off duty. Saturday classes will meet from 9 a.m. to noon and Sunday classes from 6 to 9 p.m.

Registration for the class, which carries three semester hours of credit, may be done at the first session. Tuition is \$35 per semester hour, plus a general fee of \$4 per semester hour.

Principles of organization, supervision, and administration as applied to fire protection will be covered in the class. It is intended for majors in the college's fire protection and occupational safety program, but is also open to other working firefighters.

## Learning disability class still open

Enrollment is being held open for a learning disabilities course which began May 2 at Madonna College in Livonia.

The course begins the Learnings Disabilities program started at Madonna to attempt to improve help and understanding for academically frustrated children.

Enrollees will work directly with learning disabled children besides acquiring applicable theories. The program offers either a major of 36 semester hours or minor of 28 semester hours.

Persons completing the program will be certified as learning disabled specialists. Learning disabled specialists were authorized recently in the Mandatory Special Education Act passed by the legislature.

The program is open to teachers also or to parents of disabled children interested in enrolling in the non-technical courses. Teachers may qualify as specialists after completing 12 to 18 hours of course work.

A practical work - experience will follow in the summer term and education and psychology classes will begin in the fall.

at issue," FitzPatrick told the subcommittee at a recent hearing in the City-County Building in Detroit.

"The question is - how to carry out this basic obligation of the government in a way that both guarantees the rights of the individual to counsel and protects the taxpayers who are providing the funds."

A subcommittee of the board of commissioners' committee on public safety and judiciary also is making an inquiry into the problem.

Thus far, says FitzPatrick, the inquiry has shown that procedures for determining indigency aren't uniform between Recorder's Court and Wayne Circuit Court, nor do judges within the same courts follow similar procedures.

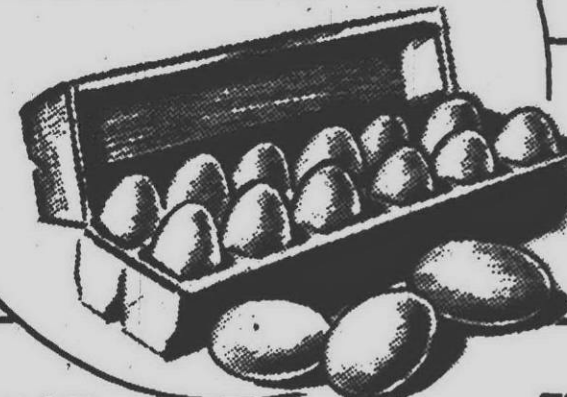

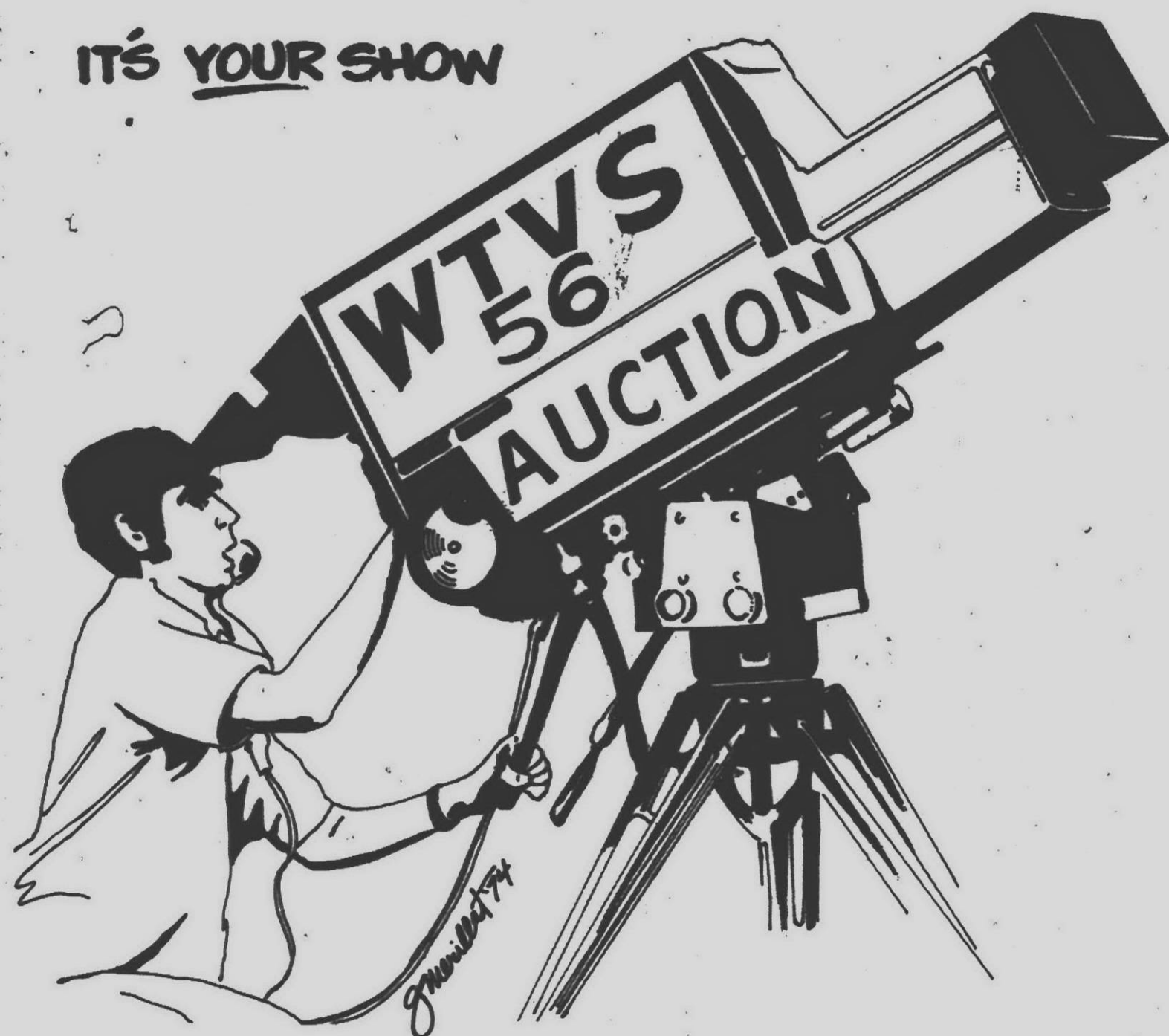

# How you can help beat the TV wasteland

### IT'S YOUR SHOW



Who brings you Sesame Street, just when you need it most? Who brought you programs like "Upstairs, Downstairs," as part of the Masterpiece Theatre television series?

And who put together that wonderful documentary on the "Twilight of the Medici" show now running at the Detroit Institute of Arts? And who brings you provocative local programming, including "It's Your Turn" and "Common Ground"?

In short, who does more to relieve the worsening wasteland of commercial television than anyone else around?

The answer is obvious. It's Channel 56, public television in the Detroit area.

**THIS IS** the week of the annual Channel 56 auction, which is designed to benefit the operations of this public-supported television station.

The proceeds of the auction pay for about one third of the station's operating budget. Last year, more than \$410,000 was raised, but soaring costs mean that even more needs to be raised this year if the station is to break even.

As of Monday, the hard-working volunteers who run the auction had just a little over \$100,000 pledged, which is \$14,000 ahead of last year's total at the same time.

But they're running short of some items, and this column is directed at merchants and private citizens who are interested in doing the entire community a service and getting a good tax deduction for themselves.

**IF YOU WANT** to donate items to the auction, especially those running in value from \$200 to \$500 (major appliances, sporting equipment, TV sets, riding lawn mowers, boats, etc.), just call

# Here's your chance to reform the school board

It's that time of the year again when a person has to wonder if voters and property owners in the various communities really are interested in what goes on.

It's the time when schools are entering the final month of classes and the fathers and mothers of the students should be turning their attentions to the activities of the school boards...especially to what the future holds and to whom the decisions of the next few years should be given.

What we are trying to say is that there is less than a week to file as a candidate for the school board and interest has been, as usual, at a low ebb.

Would you like to believe that there are no less than 11 school board seats vacant in Livonia,

Plymouth, Redford Township, Westland and Garden City, and as of this writing one would think running for one of the posts was akin to having leprosy. At least there have been few taking out nomination petitions in any of the communities.

A check of the five school systems shows Plymouth has four vacancies; Westland and Garden City two each; Livonia, South Redford and Redford Union one each.

AND THIS IS rather unusual when one con-

siders what the various boards have gone through during the past school year.

There are those parents who led delegations for hearings before the board on the topic of sidewalks or, rather, the lack of them in several sections. They said:

"If I were a member of the board I'd make sure children didn't have to walk along the side of the highways in the early mornings on their way to school. I'd get on the ball and force the county to do something about installing sidewalks everywhere students walk en route to classes."

Well, it was pointed out then the school board could do little about this. It was a matter entirely out of the hands of the trustees.

We're quite sure the parents left the room entirely dissatisfied with the results of the hearings, many vowing they would run for the board come the next election.

The deadline for filing for the next election is next Monday at 4 p.m. and these loud-talking dissidents of last fall and winter haven't come out of the woodwork yet.

Judging from the interest shown thus far, they won't, but they'll be back next fall in full voice to express their objections to this or that action of the board.

**REMEMBER LAST** winter when daylight saving time was adopted and youngsters were going to schools in the darkness of the early morning? Remember how parents stormed the meetings to complain to the board members about lack of action in starting classes later? Remember how many threatened to get the jobs of the trustees if they didn't act at once or sooner?

All we can say is the time has arrived to get on the bandwagon or stop making a big fuss to embarrass people and then quietly retire again to the woodwork until something else comes up to vent your spleen.

All the threats of the winter are forgotten by spring when the day of decision arrives, the day when each dissident has a chance to file for one of the seats on the school board and get prepared to take the same kind of medicine he or she was so loudly dishing out a few months earlier.

Remember when parents jammed the school board meeting to complain about plans to drop extracurricular activities in the high schools because of lack of funds after a millage request or renewal had been rejected at the polls?

It happened in Livonia, Plymouth and Farmington and how those parents charged into the meetings and accused trustees of being anything but good board members.

The mere thought of dropping sports and causing some standout athlete to lose a possible college or university scholarship caused the parent of that youth to just about raise the roof. The heck with the other programs, sports had to be continued so his son could get a scholarship.

Well, now is the time for these parents to get on the ball and start taking an active part in school financing and operation. Especially in Livonia where the board hasn't said much but may be faced with some drastic measures if the millage fails for a second time in June.

**ALL OF WHICH** means there isn't any time like now to start thinking of filing petitions as a candidate. There is one vacancy in Livonia. It's wide open since incumbent William Brown isn't seeking reelection. If you have been critical of the board actions and feel you have the answers to all the financial and other problems, take out a petition and begin putting your money where your mouth has been... in other words, start taking an active part and not by mouth only.

Plymouth has four vacancies with very little interest in the election at all. That has been typical of Plymouth... a lot of people making a lot of noise but not standing up to be counted.

With four spots to be filled, it would appear that every single person who has had a feeling against the board and its actions would have an opportunity to become a trustee and see how it is to be on the other side of the table. Remember the filing is Monday at 4 p.m., and if you are a

# Huber attacks windmill whichever way it spins

At the Metropolitan Fund annual meeting recently, a chief topic of conversation was how U.S. Rep. Robert Huber would react to "The Regionalist Papers," a broad proposal for a system of regional governance. There were two schools of thought.

One was that Huber, a conservative Republican from Troy, would logically favor MF's idea.

After all, didn't the research foundation propose that only counties, cities and townships have a hand in picking delegates to SEMCOG (Southeast Michigan Council of Governments), with no mention of school districts? And hadn't Huber, as a state senator, opposed bringing school districts into SEMCOG?

And didn't the Metro Fund plan call for electing delegates directly to SEMCOG? And hadn't the presence of appointive officials always bugged Huber?

And isn't our regional system a hodge-podge of agencies in the fields of planning, parks, transportation and health care planning? And wouldn't it appeal to a conservative to tie them in one neat, observable package, as Metro Fund was proposing? "LOGICALLY," I said aloud, "Bob Huber ought to like this plan." My comment was greeted with polite guffaws.

"In the first place," I was told, "you make the mistake of assuming Bob Huber will react logically." Huber, they explained, is xenophobic about Detroit and will automatically and instinctively react against any proposal that lumps the suburbs and Detroit into any kind of working arrangement.

In the second place, the veterans of the Huber wars said, Huber needs a re-election issue and will somehow tie this to cross-district school busing.

"Busing?!" said I. "What the (bleep) do 'The Regionalist Papers' have to do with busing?"

"Nothing," came the reply. "But remember, we're talking about Bob Huber, not about logic."

**HOW TRUE.** A couple days later, Huber's

forces conducted a meeting in Troy City Hall. Naturally, Huber was against it all.

"That is the way councils of government progress," he warned. "First a loose confederation, then a strong one, then it's a strong metropolitan government."

Lest any reader should become confused and ask what's wrong with metropolitan government, let it here be understood that in Huber's presence, no explanation is necessary, any more than one would explain why hobgoblins, gremlins and banshees are bad. Metropolitan government is evil, period.

Sure enough, cross-district school busing got dragged in. "There's a problem of logical progression," said Huber, "from a metropolitan government to a metropolitan school district to forced busing." Wild, huh?

**YOU WOULD THINK** that a sincere opponent of a too powerful government would infiltrate and bend the existing agencies to his way of thinking. In the case of those who are terrified of metropolitan government, you would think they would get their communities to join SEMCOG and they themselves would join Regional Citizens.

Not Huber. He's forming his own group — "Committee to Protect Local Government and Schools." A title like that sounds almost like the flag, motherhood, apple pie, big cars, liberty, nice lawns... Huzzah!

Meanwhile, the realities of life continue. The realities are that most of us live in a regional setting: We reside in one town, work in another, shop in a third, visit friends in a fourth, go to a play or a lake in a fifth. We drink Detroit water and ship our trash to Salem Township, and the cool west wind wafts our factory smoke into Detroit and Harper Woods.

"Committee to Protect Local Government and Local Schools" indeed!

**THE FIRST PERSON** to score four points wins the game. Deuce is gone. Long games are a thing of the past in team tennis. This is a concession to television so match lengths are more predictable.

Nine point tie breakers will be played in any set tied at six all or in the event the total games won by each player for the two sets are even. A 6-4, 4-6 split would result in a 10-10 score and necessitate a tie-breaker.

## Administrators not excessive

EDITOR:

Many of your readers have voiced the perennial concern about the "large number and high salaries of administrators" in the Livonia School District. It just isn't so!

If you rank the 36 school districts in Wayne County from the highest to the lowest in administrators costs, Livonia is 34th. River Rouge is No. 1, spending 5.2 per cent of its operating funds or \$77 per student on administrator costs. Taylor ranks 36th with expenditures of \$15.03 per student or 1.7 per cent of its operating dollars.

Livonia spends \$22.19 per student or 2.3 per cent of its total operating money to rank 34th. In the Livonia School District, an administrator supervises more professional staff than all but three of the 36 Wayne County school

districts. In Harper Woods, each administrator only supervises eight professionals; in Redford Union, he or she is responsible for 20.95 subordinates. The Livonia School District ranks No. 33 in Wayne County because each administrator supervises 17.98 professionals.

For any of your readers who want to discuss this issue further, I invite them to sit down with any member of their board of education and the latest issue of the annual report on the school districts in the six-county metropolitan area published by the Metropolitan Detroit Bureau of School Studies Inc.

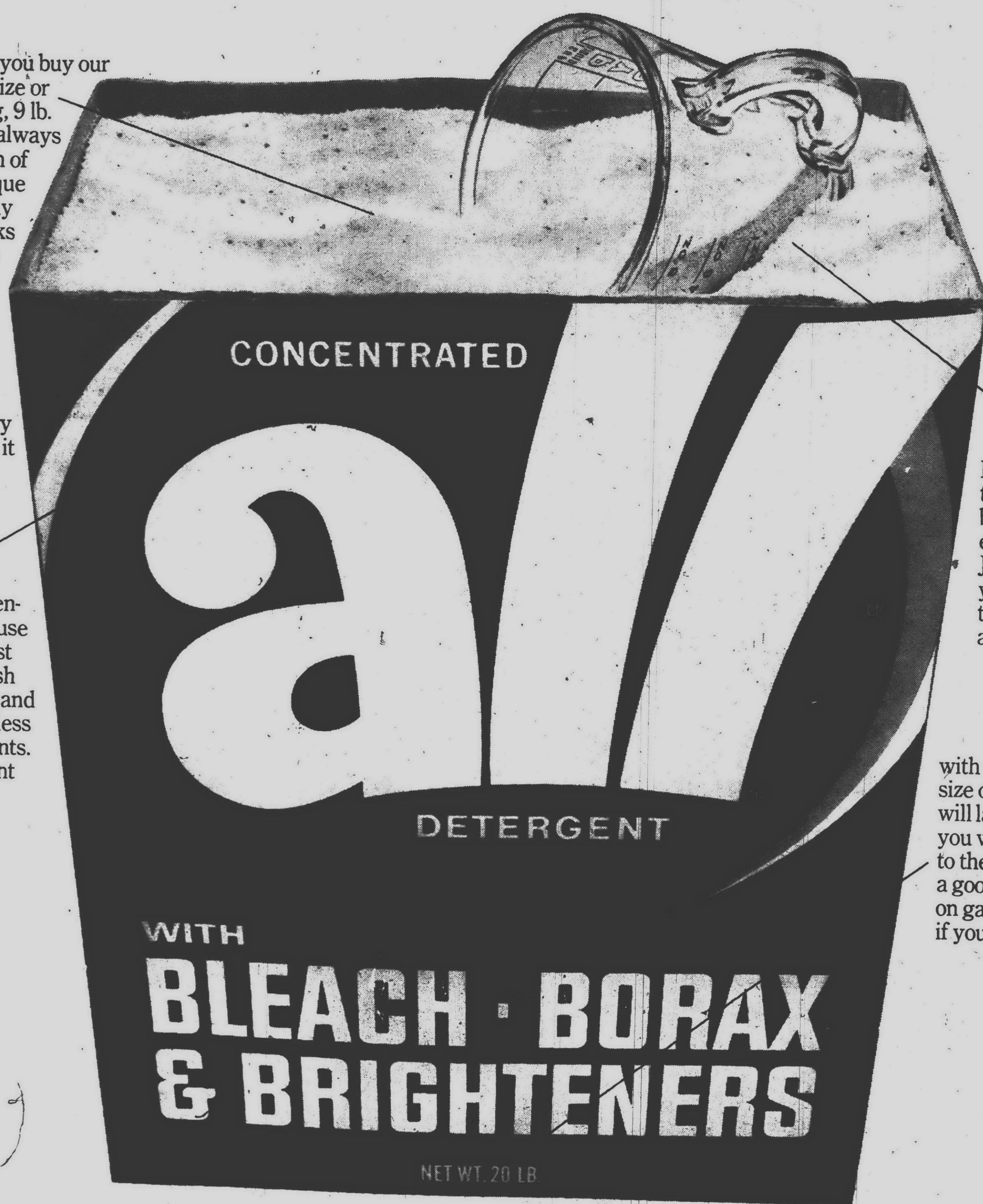

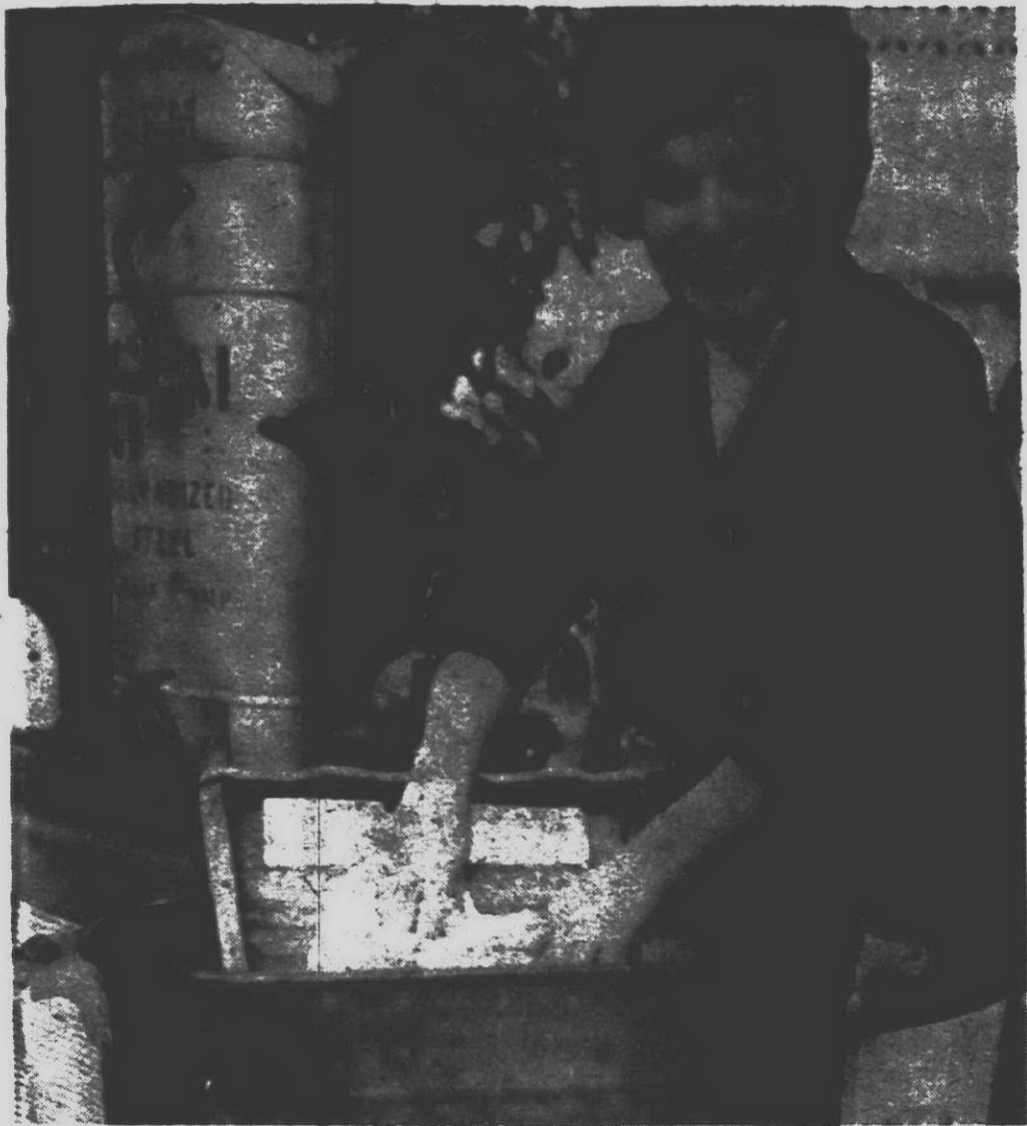

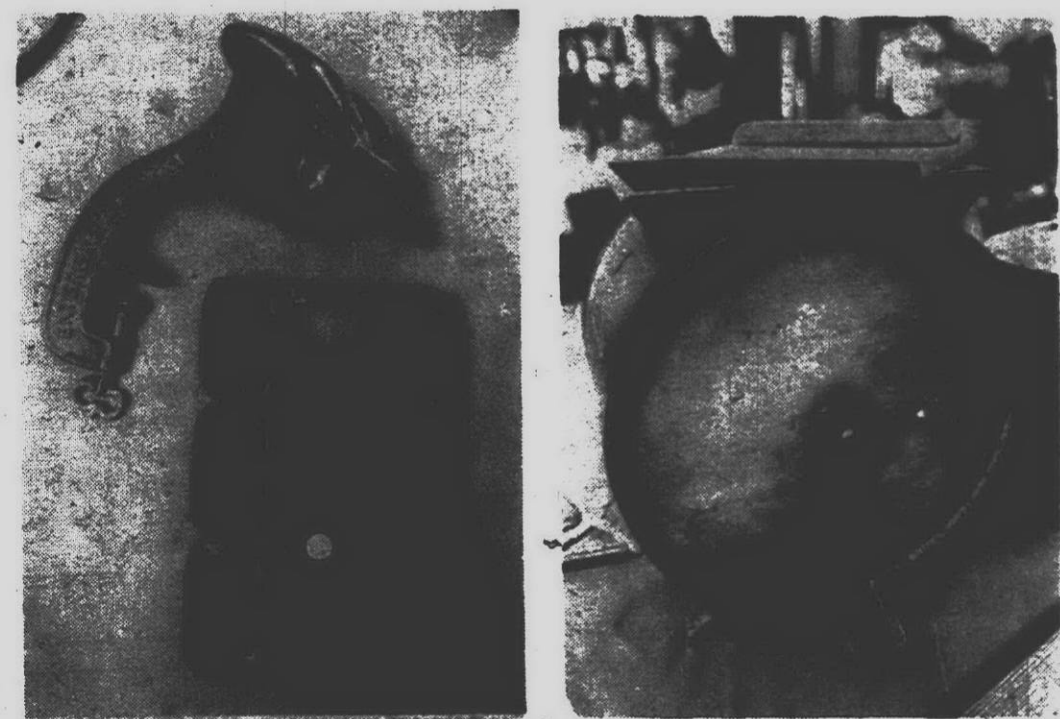

## 'Establish identity,' women alone advised

Only an occasional snuffle or a discreet blowing of a nose or two betrayed how close to the surface was the grief, hurt or anger of the women who had come to hear Dr. Glen Chaffee speak at the "Alone Again" series at Schoolcraft College.

They had come all the way out to Schoolcraft not to pursue their favorite hobby, learn to write or take shorthand.

They had come because not long ago something pretty terrible had happened to them. Each had lost a husband, either through death, divorce or separation. Now they were having to run their lives and their families as women alone.

From Dr. Chaffee, director of the Metro Guidance Center in Farmington, they were seeking answers about themselves, their children and the position in which they have found themselves.

Possibly something of a seeker himself, Dr. Chaffee, who has been a high school teacher, a minister lecturer and is both a certified marriage counselor and consulting psychiatrist, ad-

ressed himself forcefully to the subject of identity.

Develop your own identity, he suggested to the women. "Without identity, who are you?" he asked. "A body that is mechanical and terribly lonely. Is that living?"

He explained, "Each one of you is unique and that is good. Some of you try to hide your uniqueness and that is bad."

He pointed out the mistakes that many women make when they marry.

"They marry to complete themselves. They pick someone who represents what they want to be. They marry a person as a trophy, and they marry because of their own feelings of being inadequate," he said.

A marriage such as this often results in a symbiotic relationship, he claimed. Two people then live in the same life space with one identity. The whole world is in each other, which is not a healthy relationship.

"What is destructive about such a relationship is what the two people had to go through to get there," he said. "They had to lose their identity to preserve the marriage."

He continued, "Nobody can live in a marriage without problems and disagreement. But in a symbiotic relationship, the couple can't even talk

about their problems. It's too threatening. By not allowing themselves to deal with important things on their minds they lose their individuality.

Soon the only thing left in the marriage is what they agree about."

From the audience a woman spoke, saying everything she had done was

for her husband — was that wrong?

Dr. Chaffee explained there was danger in a relationship in which the

very basic settings and simple garb that changes with props and accessories.

"What we need is an exit right and an exit left," she told Mrs. Barbara Frank of the Y Women's Club and Mrs. Olga Cameron of the Rotary Anns. "It's nice when you have a stage and curtain, but if they are not possible, that's life."

Both will be provided for the per-

individual is "giving, giving, giving so that she gives herself away. Then there is nothing left of her."

"Usually men can't handle much giving from their wives — they don't know what they are going to have to pay for it," he said. "A husband doesn't like to feel responsible for his wife's emotional well-being and vice versa. Neither of them should have to be responsible for the emotional health of the other."

In a symbiotic relationship, one partner doesn't know life without the other, he explained.

"If widowed, the person remaining seems to have lost her life too," he said. "She feels something has been pulled out of her, leaving her with little. But women are lucky in one way. Our culture lets them look at their problems and talk about them. Such a situation is often more painful to men because they can't look at it."

Dr. Chaffee contrasted this with a marriage in which two people did not sacrifice their identity. The differences between them enhanced each other's existence.

Neither of them swallow up the other and they were bound together because of their commitment to each other.

The question of dealing with the children was the topic most frequently introduced from the floor.

"You will not have anything to give your kids if you don't have yourself, your own identity," warned Dr. Chaffee. "If your own self makes you happy, then you will make them happy."

He cautioned members of his audience to tell their children, "It's my turn. I need time for myself."

Being children, they will grasp onto you to what ever extent you let them, he contended. While he believed that all an infant's demands must be met for him to become emotionally healthy, "you don't do a teen-ager a favor by giving in to his demands."

Children often incur trauma because of the death or separation of their parents, he explained. A parent can monitor the extent of his trauma by watching for signs of anxiety.

Does he sleep well, does he bite his nails, pull at his hair, exhibit anti-social behavior? These might be signs that would indicate the need for professional advice.

"If this trauma is caught early, and if the child has a chance to talk the situation through with someone not emotionally involved, he can be helped," Chaffee reported. "Otherwise he seems to drag it through life with him picking up additional trauma as he goes."

To prevent trauma he suggested to the women that they try to maintain a warm, healthy relationship with their children, and try to see that they have similar relationships with father substitutes.

But, he cautioned, "Don't do things for your children that they can do themselves. A five-year-old is old enough to assume the responsibility for getting himself to school on time."

Dr. Chaffee had a number of suggestions for his listeners in answer to several questions concerning how they could begin to establish their own identity.

"Don't isolate yourselves," he told them. "Go where you can build relationships — clubs, churches or schools."

Do something that is you. Stop feeling you have to live according to the expectations of others. Develop a hobby. Go back to school — that is often a great way to build up a life of your own.

"Don't be afraid of making a mistake. Get moving. You can't steer a ship that is not moving."

"Let your insides talk to you instead of letting the outside world tell you everything," he urged.

Dr. Chaffee's lecture was sponsored by the Women's Continuum at Schoolcraft, directed by Nancy Dufour. The second lecture in the series "Alone Again" will take place May 9.

Dr. Virginia Van Coevering, a counselor and specialist in the problems of the aging, will talk on "The Grieving Process" at 8 p.m. in the Forum Building Theater.

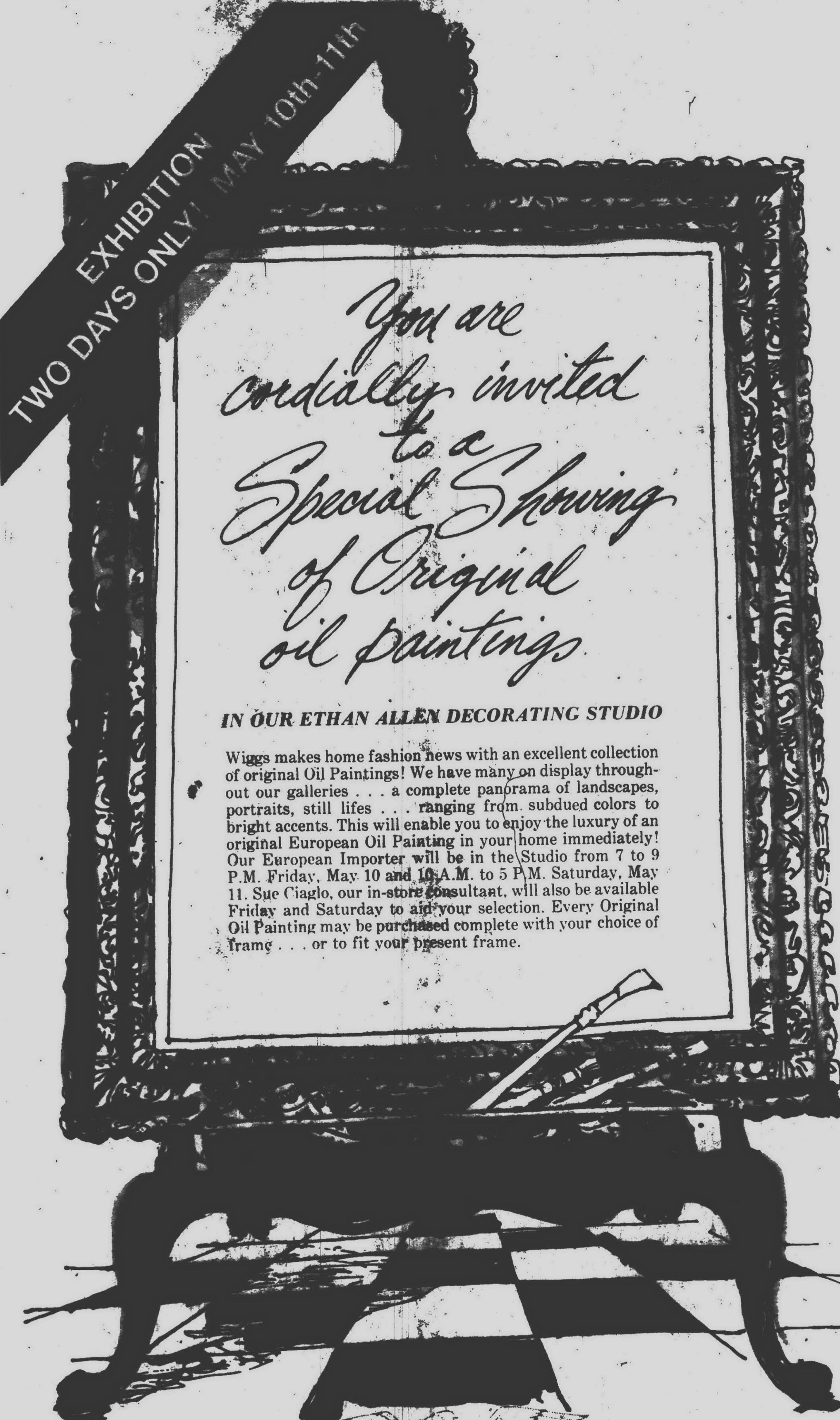

## Hometown girl is bank manager

Grinning from ear to ear, the elderly gentleman made his way to the desk of the new manager of National Bank of Detroit's branch on Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth.

"Congratulations," he told Mrs. Betty Pint.

"Known her since she was that high," he added to anyone who wanted to listen, holding an outstretched palm chest high.

Congratulatory messages like that have been coming regularly for Mrs. Pint, a life-long resident of Plymouth who was selected last month to head

the NBD branch where she had been senior assistant manager for five years.

"Of course I've worked for this promotion," Mrs. Pint said, "and I had been told not too long ago that I was considered ready for it."

"I really am pleased that the spot was found in this bank where I have been working. The people here and the neighborhood are great."

Betty Pint grew up in Plymouth and she and her husband of nearly four years, John Pint, live in the house that was home for many years to her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry Brown. She went to work for the Plymouth

United Savings bank in 1943 as a bookkeeper.

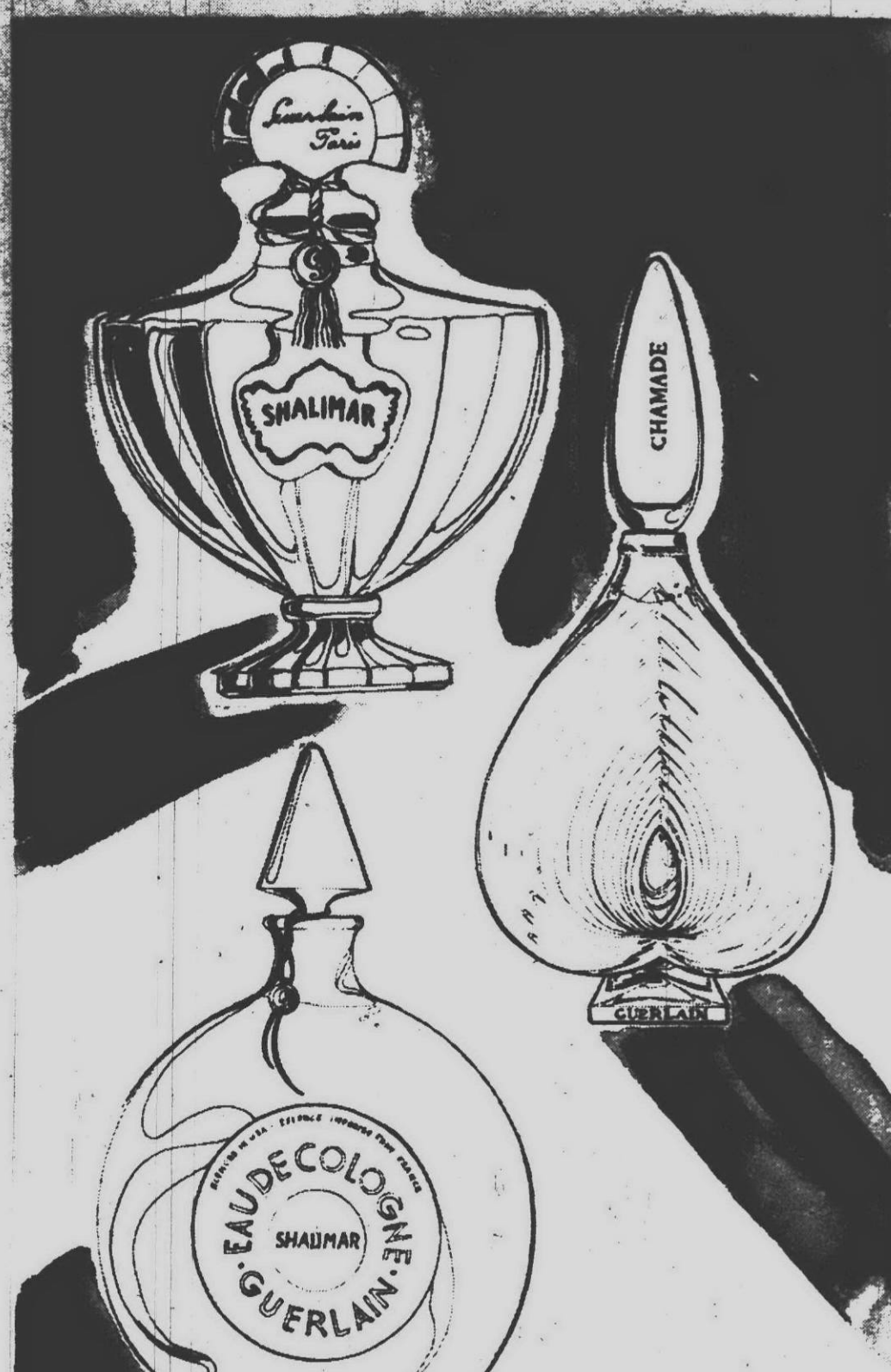

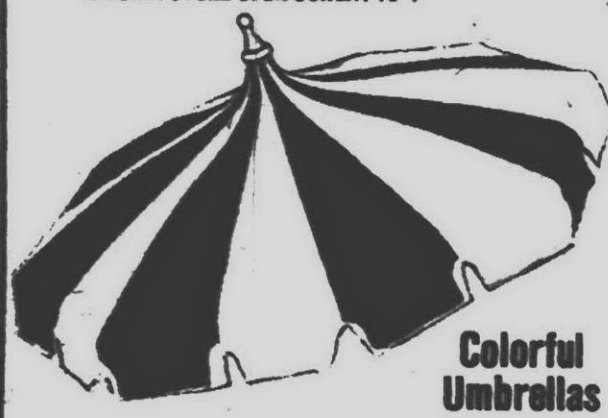

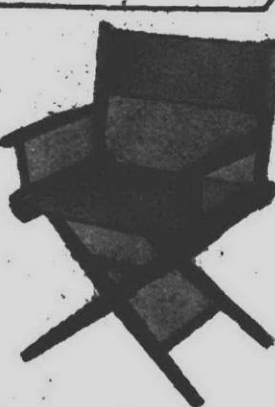

# Slim down waistline as you shape up house.

If you're shaping up your house for spring, you can shape up your body at the same time.

Vacuuming, cleaning, mopping and even bed making can be turned into times of fat trimming, waistline slimming and body toning.

Ruth Anne McKeown, one of six consumer information specialists for Johnson Wax, suggested a number of housework exercises while in Birmingham last week.

It is advisable to check your fitness program out with your doctor before gradually working into it. Avoid shoes with heels but don't be afraid of adding rhythmic music and a leotard to the housework routine.

ONE EXERCISE can be incorporated into the daily chore of bed making. When making beds, unfold the sheets with a wide - from - the - shoulder stretch. When tucking sheets in, do it from a knee-bend position.

Another easy exercise can be remembered when dusting. When wip-

ing a wide or large surface, do it from the far side to get the most stretch from it. Use a knee bend with back erect when dusting furniture legs.

On the heartier side is a vacuuming exercise which works to firm thighs and waist.

FROM a feet-together, body-erect position, right hand grasping the vacuum, lunge forward on your right foot, pushing the vacuum forward.

Return to a feet-together position, drawing the vacuum back.

Lunge 30 degrees to the right and return.

Next lunge at a right angle to the body and return.

After three lunges to the right, transfer the vacuum to the left hand and repeat three times lunging to the left with the left foot.

RETURN to feet-together, body-erect position after each lunge.

Move to another spot and repeat. Gradually work up to a total of 20 lunges to each side.

Damp floor mopping provides another time to smooth thighs and slim the waist.

Holding the mop handle with both

LOWER leg and reverse, raising your left leg obliquely to the right, resting on the right palm and using the left hand to apply wax on the left side in three clockwise and three counterclockwise circles.

Another trimmer, a take-off on traditional dumb bells, is the use of two empty product containers which have large handles carved out of the bottle.

Fill each bottle with two pounds of sand or bath salts and close them tightly.

LIE on the floor with arms at the sides, palms up, grasping the dumb bells.

Raise arms, keeping elbows straight until the dumb bells meet overhead at right angles to the shoulder. Lower arms to the floor.

Close and open arms, inhaling to the count of three as you raise, exhaling to the count of five as you lower.

hands, slide the mop over the floor surface to the left as you bend both knees to the right. Return to starting position.

Then slide the mop to the right and bend the knees to the left. Repeat several times on each side.

THEN MOVE to another spot and repeat, gradually working up to a total of 20 on each side.

Unwanted inches can come off when waxing the floor but this exercise is suggested for waxing small areas, not an entire floor.

Sit erect on the floor with legs extended. Raise the right leg obliquely to the left, bracing yourself on your left hand.

With a small amount of buffing wax on a cloth held in the right hand, make three large clockwise circles on the floor, followed by three large counterclockwise circles, keeping the leg raised with the knee straight.

# Collecting clothing keeps retiree busier than ever

You think YOU have too many extra articles of clothing lying around the house?

Then meet Mrs. Mary R. Evans of

Plymouth. She has a houseful.

Last week she sent 52 boxes of clothing to Father Reed in Casaway, W. Va., because she had read that the miners and their families in that community were in desperate circumstances.

Before that she filled six large plastic bags for poor children in the northern part of the state who use them while attending camp.

Before that she sent thousands of pounds of clothing to the Ottawa Indians in Cross Village, Mich. An additional thousands of pounds of clothing have been sent to St. Joseph Orphanage in Chamberlain, S.D., and to the Tekakwitha Indians in that state.

She has even sent loads to Archbishop Dennis Hurley in Durban, South Africa.

Fifteen years ago Mrs. Evans was launched on this philanthropic enterprise by the sudden end to the pain she had been experiencing following a household accident.

"With my sisters I went to 'cure day' at St. Joseph Oratory in Montreal," she explained. "While the monsignor was blessing all the sick I suddenly felt a terrible thirst. When I was able to take a drink, the pain left my chest, head and spine and I have had no pain ever since."

She promised St. Joseph she would do whatever he wanted her to do, in Chamberlain," she said. "I emptied my linen closet of towels, sheets and wash cloths. I sent clothes, silverware, toys and books to them."

Without knowing it Mrs. Evans, now 75, was launched on a retirement career. "I am glad I can help people who are in need," she pointed out.

She has given over an attic and a bedroom to the large amounts of clothing that flood into her house, are packaged and then ebb out the door to the freight office or post office.

In previous years truckers have picked up and carried her packages at little or no expense to herself. But lately she has found this to be increasingly difficult with several sets of freight companies needed.

Today she often has to find help to have her packages - which she handles herself - taken to the post office for mailing. She pays the postage from her social security money. In her career she estimates she has used 100 pounds of cord for wrapping. She is constantly on the search for boxes with the tops still on for the clothes.

Most of the clothing is donated to her by her neighbors. Some comes from the box set up for public clothing donation by St. Vincent DePaul.

# Y program special for mothers and daughters

The night was dark and still. From the woods beyond the campfire came the sounds of Indian drums followed by the voice of the Great Spirit. But the girls around fire were not frightened by the solemn ceremony in which they were participating. They were with their mothers and they knew that nothing could harm them. The occasion was the induction of

new members into the Indian Maiden Federation of the Livonia Family Y. And while the most recent ceremony took place behind the Y building, others often take place at Camp Storer near Jackson, where the local tribes journey for weekends. "The point of all this pageantry, color and excitement is primarily to bring mothers together with their daughters for an unhurried few hours each month," said Mrs. Mary Palek, who spent four years in the organization with her daughter, Mary J. and is

currently at it again with a second child, Margie. "It gives me a chance to spend time alone with my daughters as well as work with them in a group," she added. Continuing, she said, "Not long ago we had a skating outing planned and for a few minutes it was an effort for me to get up there. But it was certainly worth it. As we were leaving Margie turned to me and said, 'I'm glad we're Indian Maidens so I can go somewhere with you by myself.'"

To Mrs. Paulette Tamm it is a fantastic program. "It gives me a chance to get away from household tasks and enjoy myself with my two daughters," she said. Pauline is 10 and Karen is eight and "they love it," according to their mother, who is president of the Indian Maiden Federation. For three and a half years they have participated together in activities such as roller and ice skating, visiting an apple orchard or the Youth

Theater at the Detroit Institute of Arts. They also took part in the production of "Bedknobs and Broomsticks" recently presented by the group to raise money for Livonia children to be able to go to camp. "I find the induction ceremony very impressive," reported Mrs. Mary Janowski, known to some as a housewife and mother but to others as the chief of the Chippewa tribe. "It is dark and quiet and the mothers first are given a kernel of corn

which they throw on the fire, saying at the same time their Indian name," she said. "Their act symbolizes the throwing out of any spirit of selfishness or impatience they may have." She added, "Then the little Indian Maidens go to the fire and throw in their kernels of corn, for the same symbolic reason. It is very beautiful." "Basically I think what they like best about the whole program is the chance to do things with their mother," she concluded.

## Freedom of religion vs freedom of the press

"The whole story of Wounded Knee 1973," suggests the Rev. Lester Heins of Minneapolis, is "a complete history of the free exercise of religion."

Rev. Heins is pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit in Minneapolis. Heins was in court last week, appearing to be an unwilling witness in a case involving the free exercise of religion.

When the Rev. Paul J. Heins, Lutheran Social Service Department director, was asked in court why he saw carrying guns during the occupation of Wounded Knee, he refused to testify.

Rev. Heins' silence in this regard is part of the traditional confidentiality which allows for clergy-penitent, attorney-client and physician-patient relationships.

A spokesman for the Department of Justice has told this columnist that Rev. Heins was not asked to disclose anything that had been told to him in confidence.

He was simply asked to testify as to what he saw done by Indians (who were hardly penitent or confessional) while they allegedly wrecked the town of Wounded Knee, including the local Catholic church.

Because there are numerous unnamed witnesses available, who cannot claim Rev. Heins' confidentiality, the Justice Department spokesman said that there are no plans at this time to appeal a court ruling which has upheld Rev. Heins.

Moreover, the American Lutherans have been joined, in a 38 page Amicus Curiae (friend of the court) brief, advocating this widened standard of clergy privilege, by the National Council of Churches, the U.S. Catholic Conference, the Lutheran Church in America, the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, the United Presbyterian Church.

This seems, at least for the time being, to have established Rev. Heins' right to conceal what he saw these Indian gunmen doing at Wounded Knee (at least one of whom was carrying a Soviet AK-47 assault gun).

If this should really be regarded as part of the traditional clergy-penitent relationship, no clergyman should ever again be subpoenaed to testify about anything that he sees happen within his parish boundaries (if anywhere) - whether an automobile accident, robbery or homicide. For he, like Rev. Heins at Wounded Knee, would be trying to relate to non-parishioners.

The Lutherans and their allied denominations even go so far as to con-

tend that clergy are more entitled to such privileges of confidentiality than are newsmen, with regard to protecting their sources.

"The right directly protected by the free press clause (of the U.S. Constitution) is the right of publication and dissemination. News gathering is a means to that end, and the confidentiality of sources is of some utility in the gathering of news."

Some utility? Any newspaper who reveals his sources is finished as a news-gathering reporter - either by exposing corruption in big ecclesiastical government.

The Founding Fathers, most of whom were church members, apparently felt that organized religion should be no more sacrosanct from the scrutiny of a free press than should the civil government.

Hence, there is no distinction whatsoever between the first amendment's guarantee of both free exercise of religion and freedom of the press.

But the Lutherans and their allies contend that while courts may constitutionally force a reporter to "breach the confidence of his source," clergy confidences must be fully respected - even regarding armed bandits at work at Wounded Knee.

This is clericalism hardly befitting the ecclesiastical descendants of Martin Luther. It amounts to a proposal that clergy should be trusted, but not newsmen. It is advocacy of a despicable double standard whereby those of us who are ordained, as well as professional journalists, should be trusted in the confessional - but not in the newsroom.

## Charismatic crusade set in Plymouth

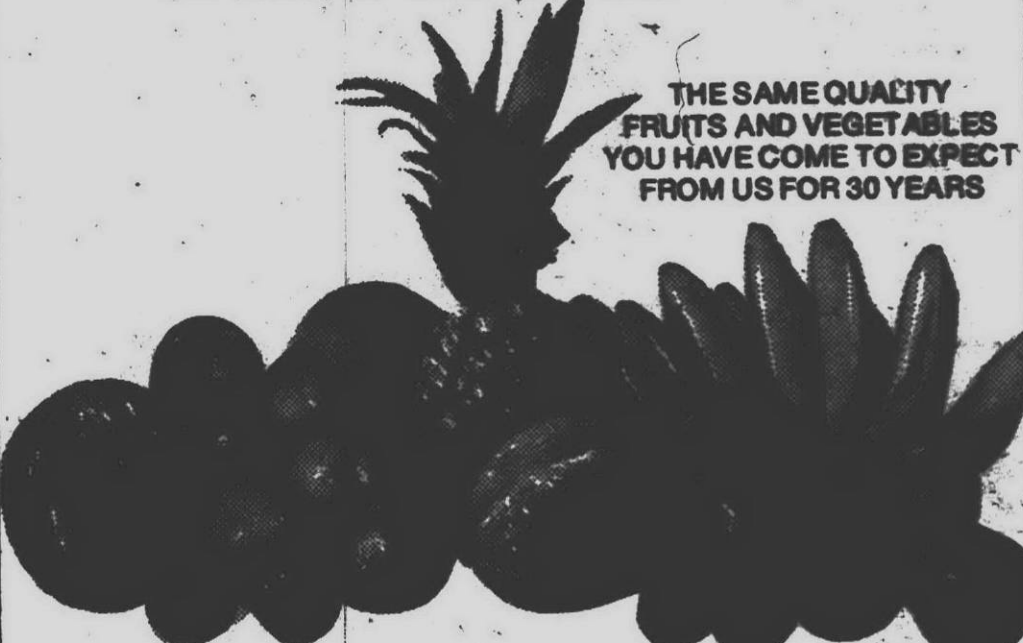

The Schoolcraft Gymnastics Club won the 15 and over bracket.

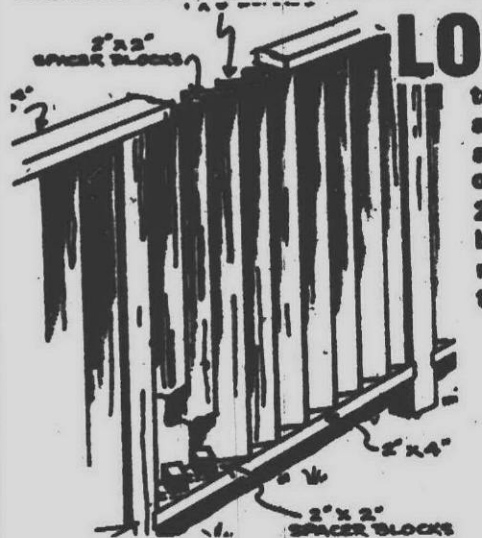

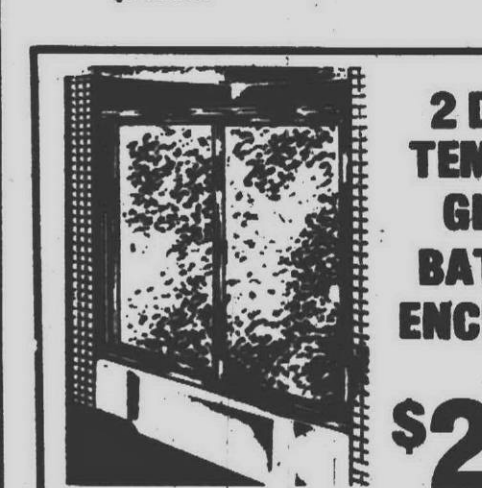

ford Union at 3:15 p.m. and Franklin against Bishop Borgess at 5:30 p.m.

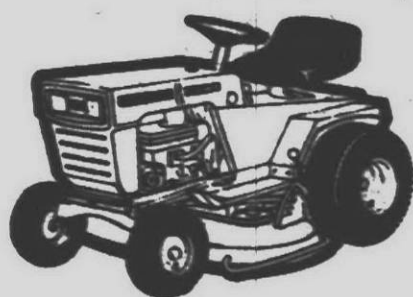

# Churchill wins 4th Observer Relays

## Scores record 30½ points

One would have to surmise that Fred Price's smile couldn't be any brighter these days.

The Churchill track coach, who was selected Coach-of-the-Year in '73, has his Panthers off and running for an instant replay of the "Year of the Charger."

It was his Charger squad that wound up in a tie with Stevenson for top honors last year in the Observer Relays.

This time around the Charger cindermen made no mistake about it and came up with the highest point total ever recorded by a team in the now four year old newspaper sponsored relay meet.

Price's crew won the 18 school relay with 30½ points with city rival and defending co-champion Stevenson winding up in second with 25½.

Then it was host Redford Union with 23, Bentley with 18 and Northville in fifth at 14.

A crowd of over 1500 attended the day long meet and witnessed the breaking of four meet records with Bentley snapping marks in both the 440 and 880 relays.

Churchill, which exceeded the previous relay high by four points, put together three firsts, three seconds, one third and one fifth to score in eight of the 12 events.

The Charger foursome of Craig Gul-

ly, Phil LaFave, Bob Mendoza and Ken Landini won the sprint medley relay in 2:30.4; Rick Powers, Paul Schulz and Mike Fisher won the pole vault relay with a total of 35 feet and the quartet of Mike Edmons, Mendoza, Gully and Landini tied for first in the mile relay in 3:30.6.

Churchill's seconds came in the high jump, four-mile and long jump relays. The third was in the shot put and the fifth in the 880 relay.

Second place Stevenson captured just one first in the four mile relay where Steve Galindo, Chuck Minear, Steve Brown and Steve White clocked in at 18:20.1 for a meet record, bettering Churchill's '72 clocking of 18:37.1.

Bentley, which finished fourth in team standings, came up with an outstanding display of leg power in winning the two mile, 440 and 880 relays.

It was the identical crew of Bill Brown, Rick Hammill, Darrell Ditzhazy and Brian Murphy that won the 440 and 880 relays in record setting times. The 440 was clocked in at :44.2 and the 880 in 1:32.0.

The Bulldog foursome of Dan Reum, Kevin Farr, Steve Kovach and Steve Spreitzer won the two-mile in 8:14.9.

Host RU which enjoyed the lead up to the final three events won the high jump and long jump relays.

The Panthers took the high jump with a combined distance of 17 feet to better the meet record of 17-foot-10 set by RU in '72. The long jump crew

of O'Grady, Helzer and Greg Broquet also took the long jump with a distance of 58-feet-5½.

With three events remaining, RU stood with 23 points, Churchill had 20 and Stevenson with 16½.

RU dropped the baton in the 440 which was won by Bentley with Stevenson taking a third. RU was shutout in the mile relay with Churchill winning and it was Churchill first and Stevenson second in the pole vault with RU again shutout.

The shot put title went to Bishop Borgess which collected 140-feet-9½ in the efforts of Chris Rzeznek, Tom Birney and Steve Jaremski. Farmington won the remaining first in the distance medley relay. The foursome of Guiterreze, McPrice, VanMeter and Mike McGuire clocked in at 10:56.0.

Observer individual champions were Stevenson's Fred O'Keefe in the pole vault at 13 feet; RU's Scott O'Grady in the high jump at 6-foot-2; Northville's Tim Porterfield with a shot put toss of 52-feet-5½ and Churchill's Phil LaFave in the long jump with a leap of 20-feet-6.

Meet Director John MacKenzie, head coach of the RU track squad, might have had his disappointments in finishing third, but was elated at the smoothness the meet was handled with the final event--the pole vault over at 9:45 p.m. as compared to previous year's midnight showings.

"Heck, we even sold out our 500 hot dogs and 400 candy bars," finished

MacKenzie who is already making plans for the 5th annual Observer Relays next year.

And with Stevenson High winning the girls' feature 440 relay race in :15.0 over Plymouth South, Redford Union, Churchill, and Plymouth Canton and more girls' teams wanting to partake, No. 5 should prove to be another barnburner to the finish.

Look out boys, those petite loveable little things that you used to cuddle up with every Saturday night at the drive-ins are at it again.

Instead of dressing up in your most impressive outfits to take out the girl of your choice, you might very well find yourself in some sort of facsimile of a track outfit and out jogging five or 10 miles instead.

In this day of women's lib and the female athletic movement, girls' track has made its move and all signs point towards a permanent fixture.

Of the 14 schools in the area, only two are without female track squads. And these two, Clarenceville and St. Agatha, are not far behind.

Now don't get me wrong, I am not twirling my moustache down at the fairer sex scantily clothed and exhibiting bodies in all sorts of contortions.

Maybe the high school boy of today likes to see this in the one he makes "goo-goo eyes" at or maybe the high school boy isn't caught making "goo-goo eyes" anymore.

Anyhow taking in a few of these girls' track meets in the area it became quite obvious that this is not a joke in any sense of the words for these girls.

In fact, for the most part they are dead serious about track.

"There just aren't enough qualified people around willing to give up their time to help this sport," said the RU coach in its first year of competition around Panther territory.

"Coaches are not plentiful and it is going to take men to get the program going. Women coaching need a push and of course the ideal situation will be to have woman coaching the girls. But right now the men have got to pitch in and help.

"Equipment is also another big problem.

"Nothing fits the girls. Most track shoes are too big and I feel like I have looked around the world and back for heel caps to fit my girls.

"The state is really giving girls' track a push and it is going to take a real boost on the local level. And hey, these girls want to learn. I really have to believe that girls have more desire to want to learn than the boys at this age.

"The girls want to compete. And I don't really think that girls are more emotional than boys. In fact they are willing if not more willing to accept details and the challenge than the boys.

"Heck the girls are right out there criticizing themselves but they do show more emotion when it comes to

injuries, simply because they don't understand them.

But again it was quite obvious that the seriousness of the competition was not carried out in the way the meets are run.

Experienced, qualified people are needed to run a high school varsity level track meet and these people are not to be found, at least not on the cinder track.

At a recent meet at Livonia Stevenson, people who were running the show were far and few between. The students themselves were running the meet and would question in between jumps to one another if the person fouled or didn't.

Granted girls' track is a new sport in the area but not enough people are taking it seriously and the girls, along with struggling with new concepts, shouldn't have to put up with inept meet conditions.

Redford Union girls' track Coach Mike Krafchak, who has taken on the task of compiling the girls' area ratings for the Observer & Eccentric, is one who wants to see it get off the ground.

"Here at RU, the boys track team first laughed at the girls but once they saw how serious the girls were, they have really helped out with the basics.

"Each and every community has to be made aware of the need at this level," finished Coach Mike Krafchak.

The spirit and drive of these girls are written all over their faces. If you haven't already, get yourself out to your area high school and take in one of the girls' track meets and if you feel really like becoming a part of offer your services, if in nothing more than a clap of the hands or a smile.

Move over boys, the girls are on their way.

# Turf Tips, Quips

It may not mean much to harness racing fans in this area but the rich Hambletonian classic, for three-year-old trotters, has been returned to DuQuoin, Ill. for the next three years. One of the conditions for returning the trotting championship to its Illinois home was that management add \$125,000 to the purse. That will make the classic the richest three-year-old harness racing event in North America.

There was a time when Wolverine Raceway considered making a bid for the Hambletonian but, dropped out when it became apparent the eastern tracks had ganged up in a move to get it for Liberty Bell.

Thus it was awarded to Liberty Bell last fall for the next three years but apparently the track management didn't read all of the fine print which specified that all events scheduled for the Hambletonian week must be raced over a mile track.

The Liberty Bell management was

under the assumption that only the big stake had to go over a mile track and the other Grand Circuit races be raced over the five-eighths surface. Thus when they received the contract from the Hambletonian Society and noticed the provisions they refused to sign and decided it would be better to drop the entire matter.

So the society took another vote and decided to award the three-year contract to DuQuoin after track officials had agreed to boost the purse. All races during Hambletonian week will be over a mile track inasmuch as that is what the southern Illinois plant has.

Where does Wolverine enter into this picture? The Livonia-based track also has a big mile track and could easily have qualified had officials known all of the facts earlier. Of course coming up with \$125,000 to add to the purse would make most track managements think twice before bidding for a contract.

Two familiar faces made several

appearances in the winner's circle at the Detroit Race Course last week and each one must have been a joy for the bettors.

Glenn Brogan, off to one of his best starts ever at the big mile track, had a four-bagger Saturday and just missed making it five. Three of his winners were odds-on favorites and won rather easily.

At the same time, it appears a bit of exposure in one of the Metropolitan dailies earlier in the week worked wonders with veteran Bobby Baird who admits to more than 50 years.

Bobby had eight winners in a matter of three days with a double and two triples. Just an indication that Baird can't be sold short at any time... he may have a bit of age but he still is the best at the DRC in getting his mounts away from the post quickest of all and keeping them in front.

With Larry Snyder, perennial jockey champion trying his luck in Chicago this year, the DRC race for the

1974 title should be one of the most interesting in years.

From Lansing comes word that the bill approving Sunday racing may come up for a vote sometime this week. As could be expected there is opposition to Sabbath programs in Livonia and Hazel Park.

However, word from other states where the programs have been approved and racing is being held on Sundays, there is nothing but favorable comment. Matter of fact a harness racing plant in Delaware has afternoon and night cards on Sundays with the crowds getting larger each week.

Cleveland, which took advantage of the Sunday racing law several weeks ago, has enjoyed tremendous success and track officials report no complaints at all.

With so many states approving Sunday racing, it would seem like just a matter of time before Michigan joins the list. Our information from Lansing is that a couple of hearings will be held during the early part of the week and the House may take favorable action before end of the week, depending on what the legislators hear at the meetings.

If you think the area's two thoroughbred tracks aren't vitally interested, then you have been getting the wrong information. Both the Detroit Racing Association and Hazel Park Racing Association managements are hoping the bill is approved in the next couple of weeks.

Each association feels Sunday racing will go a long way in reviving interest in a sport that has been going downhill for the past several years. They firmly believe it will be just like giving horse racing in Michigan a much needed transfusion.

Kool King, the fleet trotter owned by a group headed by Stewart Oldford of Plymouth, demonstrated it is back in top form again with an easy victory in the second race Saturday night at Hazel Park.

Kool King was anything but a cool trotter last fall when he won six in a row at Hazel Park before moving up into top company where the going was a bit too rough.

Look for Doug Ackerman, who checked into Hazel Park from California a few days ago, to become a 1,000 winner before long. Doug, who has been a regular on the Michigan pari-mutuel circuit for more years than he cares to remember, was only three or four short of that figure when he left the west coast.

He generally races at Hazel Park and Wolverine during the summer while handling numerous colts in the stake series at the county fairs. Then in early fall, Doug gathers all of his horses and heads for California and racing in the late fall, winter and early spring.

# In The Pocket

When the curtain fell on the annual ABC tournament Sunday night in Indianapolis there was little doubt that Detroit bowlers had dominated the 78-day event.

Paced by Bob Hart, they won four titles and Ray Williams left his name indelibly on the records as the first ever to roll a perfect game in the team portion of regular play.

Hart's contribution came when he took the all-events crown with a 2087 count and the doubles with Chuck Sunseri with a 1419 total that helped the Goebel team take the team all-events with 9,575.

Along with Hart's performance, Bob Strampe, the slender sharpshooter from Grosse Pointe, captained the Eonite team that won the coveted classic title.

With his three titles, Hart equaled a record and his name will forever be in the ABC record books. Bob had a chance to surpass Ed Lubanski's record of 2116 in the all-events which was set in 1950. But he came upon a tough break.

He was well on his way to the record going into the tenth frame, but drew the 4-6 split and had to be content with just winning the title.

It was much the same in the all-events where the Goebel team fell only 33 pins short of the all-time record.

Williams' performance caused more of a sensation in ABC circles when he posted his perfect game. It was the first in the 71-year history of the ABC that this ever had been accomplished.

No other city came close to matching the Detroit bowlers' performances and it proved once again that Detroit is the capital of the bowling world.

# What Plymouth area was like back in 1825

Recollections of an Early Settler

PLYMOUTH — "I held up my head although my face was scratched by going through the brush and my pants were covered with mud. I had less than a dollar in my pocket. I was now a landholder."

Abraham B. Markham thus described his feelings in December 1825, when he became the proud owner of 80 acres in Plymouth Township. He paid \$100 for the property to a government agent in Detroit. Markham's recollections, read before the State Pioneer Society in 1877 when he was 80, are one of the original sources of information about Plymouth in the pioneering days. Other primary sources are the memoirs of H. M. Utley, W. P. Yerkes and D. Clarkson, all written about 1876.

Markham was 28 when he arrived in Plymouth after backpacking from East Bloomfield, N. Y., by way of Buffalo and Canada. "Sink or swim," he wrote, "I was determined to have me a farm in the territory of Michigan. . . . At Farmington I found Uncle Arthur Powers and he directed me to a new settlement in town one south, range eight east where a man by the name of Tibbitts had settled a few months before."

Neighbors David Phillips and Gideon P. Benton helped Markham raise his log cabin, a 12 feet by 14 feet structure "to shelter me from the weather, the bears and the wolves."

Utley wrote that "these raising bees were made the occasion for considerable social hilarity. The fare was rude but hospitably dispensed and usually a specimen of their best style of cooking. Games and sports closed the day."

Markham recalls that "we had fun at the log cabin raisings as well as hard work. But we were all kind and generous and no unhappiness existed.



We were all poor alike and all rich alike. We had no lawyers, doctors, or priests to make dissensions among us. We were a happy people."

Markham had no money, but he knew how to handle an axe, was a strong and willing worker, and bartering was the custom. "Mr. Benton, a single man living with Phillips, was going to Detroit to get supplies. I prevailed upon him to get some supplies for me and I would chop for him to pay the amount advanced for me. I had no money and worked from sun-up to sun-down for 50 cents a day."

On another occasion, Markham, who must have been remarkably fit even for a pioneer, chopped one and one-half acres of timber to pay a saw-mill for 700 feet of boards to finish his house.

Markham selected seven of his heavily-timbered acres for clearing. "I soon found that I could chop one acre in six or seven days, fit for logging." Next came the planting. "I got of Mr. H. B. Smith of Farmington eight bushels of potatoes, for which I split 1,600 rails, then paid Mr. Benton two day's work for drawing in eight miles. . . . One third of them got froze before he got home so I had only six bushels to eat and plant. I ate all of them and planted the rest; that is I cut off the seed end of each and then cut this piece in two and kept those potatoes in a trough until June. In the fall I had 80 bushels of the best potatoes I ever raised."

A year and a half after he arrived, Markham had on hand 600 bushels of

ears of corn, 80 bushels of potatoes and a quantity of corn-stalks, turnips and pumpkins.

"I am selling my corn for 25 cents a bushel; potatoes at 50 cents per bushel; pumpkins \$1.25 a load. I sold over \$125 worth of produce in one year from the time I began to chop." Markham continues, with pardonable pride, "It shows what a young man can do if he will try without a single dollar or axe, or anything to eat, or a house to live in, or bed to sleep on and anything but his hands, and a disposition and will to work."

Then, as now, the soil of Plymouth favored the growth of corn. In 1826, Markham built the town's first mill, a primitive but effective device capable of grinding a bushel of corn in an hour. He made a 70 foot trench, 10 inches deep, in a large oak log. He fashioned a wheel from the butt end of the tree. An axle projected through, and four feet beyond, each side of the "wheel." A half bushel of corn was distributed along the trough. Two men ran the wheel over the corn for twenty minutes, producing a fine dish of meal.

After the first year, Markham's livestock included one cow, a yoke of steers, a calf, half a dozen hens, a sow and seven pigs. A resolution permitting pigs to run in the street was passed in 1827 when the first township election was held.

Markham held several offices in the budding community. He was secretary of the meeting in February 1827, at which the town was named. He was elected clerk of the township at its first meeting on May 25, 1827, in the barn of John Tibbitts on North Territorial Road. He drafted the organizational papers for a military company formed at a meeting, at the Tibbitts home early in 1827, at which Ira M. Hough was chosen captain.

"I was loaded down with offices. I was fence viewer, road master, collector, constable. I was after run-aways all the time. I found every one I went after. . . . Led by the tinkling of a bell I would dash through the swamps and rivers over logs and brush till I found the old bell cow, seize her by the whisk-about, and she would take a bee line for her place of duty. After milking I would take a bowl of johnny cake and milk for my supper, go to bed, and sleep like a king."

During the summer of 1827 a township tax was levied for the first time. The total tax was \$154.40, of which \$87.50 went to the county. There were 140 taxpayers. Markham was the col-

## March traffic volume down

Traffic on state highways dropped 5.9 per cent in March from a year ago.

The Michigan Highway Department reports that average weekday traffic was down in March 4.3 per cent over last year; Friday traffic was down 4.4 per cent; Saturday traffic was down 7.6 per cent; and Sunday's 11.7 per cent.

The volumes were computed on the basis of actual counts from the department's counting machines placed around the state.

Traffic in February was down 15.2 per cent from the same time a year ago and January traffic was 16.7 per cent below the previous year.

lector. "I plodded through woods and snow for about two weeks collecting. I then counted up and found I had collected enough to pay off all but \$2.50 by throwing in my fees. I went and split rails for Mr. Benton for sixty-two and a half cents per hundred and got the money and paid off, and have ever since been satisfied to live-without office."

More dangerous than the Indians were the wolves, which killed sheep, and the bears, which liked pork. There was a \$25 bounty on wolves. Markham also mentions deer, wild turkeys, snakes and a large turtle "which has on its back 1826 if he is still alive." He noted that deer were especially plentiful, and that there was no danger of any of the pioneers starving for want of meat.

What Markham and others had to say about the Potawatomi Indians who circulated through the area will appear in the next column.

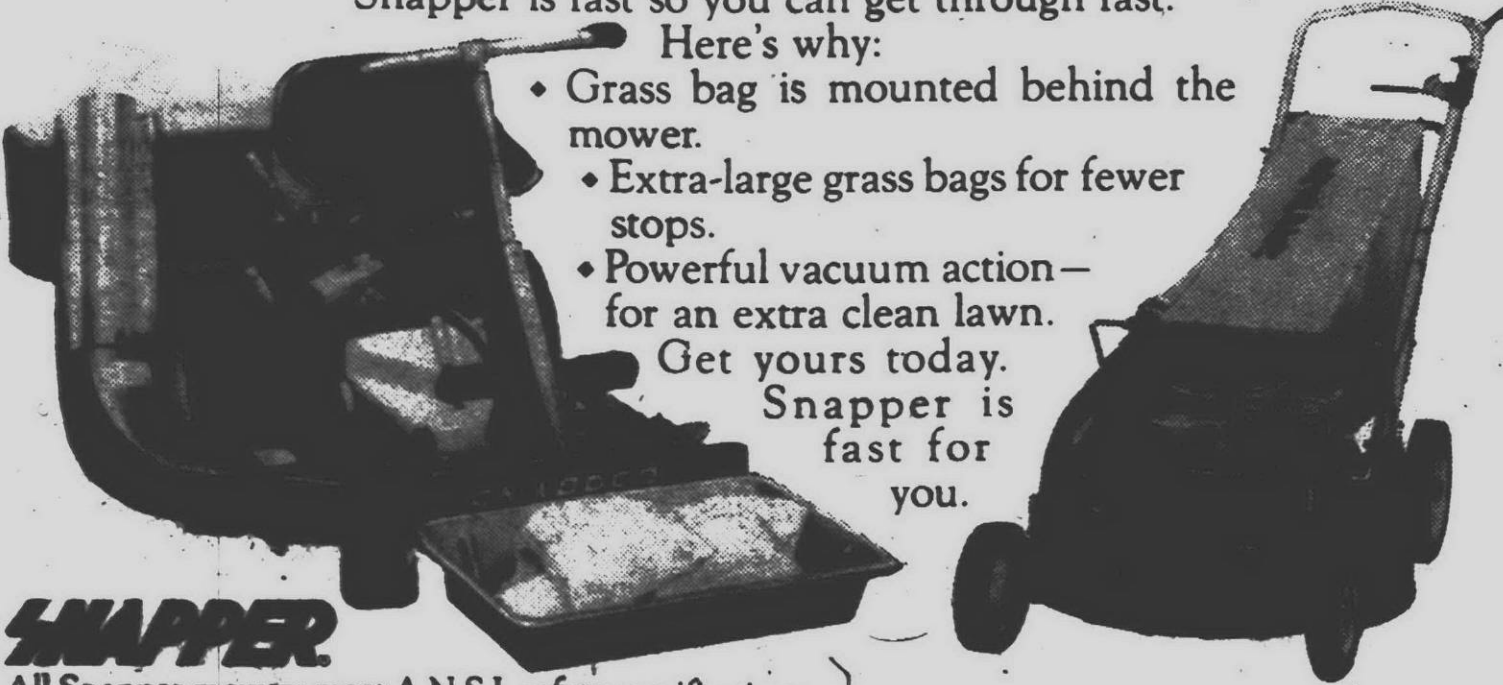

# The Green Thumb

THREE MOST popular plants for flower beds are (from top to bottom) tall, tapering snapdragons, semi-dwarf American marigolds and dainty white alyssum creating a dense edging. Snapdragons are especially a favorite bedding plants because it takes eight weeks to grow a flowering size plant from seed. After flowering in spring and early summer, the snapdragons can be cut back to flower again during the cool weather of fall. Marigolds and alyssum will survive summer's heat quite well.

Is there an easy way to get rid of dandelions in the lawn?  
With persistence you can knock them out with weed killers; but chances are they'll be back again next year. Each seed is equipped with a parachute and can blow in from your neighbor's lawn.

The best way to cope with dandelions is to eat them. Nothing beats dandelion greens, best cooked when young and tender. Some gardeners eat the roots like parsnips, peeled, sliced and double boiled. Try roasting and grinding the roots as a substitute for coffee.

The early colonists cooked dandelion leaves as a tonic against many disorders. Even the Indians made tea from the roots to relieve heartburn and cramps. We understand there's a company in Maine that has been canning dandelions and fiddlehead ferns since 1897. You can buy dandelion seed from many seed houses, in case you want to grow some in your garden.

Here's a recipe for making dandelion wine, thanks to "Lawn Care." Pour boiling water on a gallon of dandelion flowers. Steep for several days, then strain. Add three pounds of sugar, one ounce of yeast, a gallon of water and two lemons. Cover crock and leave for one week in a warm room. Strain off wine, corking it with cotton and put in a cellar for three weeks. Decant, cork tightly or cap, and wait hopefully until winter.

It's a shame to lug newspapers to the village dump when you can make them into fireplace logs for next winter.

A newspaper log lasts about a half hour. The average weekday newspaper will make two or three logs, and the Sunday edition will make up to seven logs. Not only are newspaper logs about the same as wood as an energy source, but what other fuel is delivered to your doorstep each day?

# Wallcovering made easy

The new generation of fabric-backed wall coverings and quality adhesives makes wallcovering easier than ever — especially with a little planning and following tested directions and suggestions.

Today's do-it-yourselfer on his or her first venture at redoing a room will work faster because of developments in backings and adhesives, according to home improvement advisors.

They advise that the attractiveness of many new patterns now on the market can be spoiled by using the wrong adhesive or skipping steps in preparing walls or hanging the covering.

Labor saving is also part of the wallcovering scene today because in some cases the sizing operation is eliminated by using non-staining paste or pre-sized wheat paste.

They also recommend some simple steps in preparing the wall, cutting the covering, hanging, and finishing to insure the completed walls will provide a room you'll be proud to show.

Even the elegant and expensive wallcovering can be spoiled if the wall being changed has old paint or paper remaining that will later peel or if rough areas will be noticeable.

So take time to remove old paper, fill cracks and holes, and smooth over rough areas. Use wall size as the first coat in preparing old surfaces.

However, when applying vinyl wallcovering, dilute the vinyl adhesive and use as a sizing agent.

Now that you have the walls smooth, accumulated all the necessary tools, measured the height of the wall and selected the proper adhesive, you're ready to unroll the covering.

A large enough table will be needed so you can lay the covering, face up, to measure the amount needed, plus six inches, that will cover a strip of wall from ceiling to baseboard. The additional inches will give you an allowance for trim.

Then lay the second strip next to the first, match the pattern and cut to the same length. By laying the second strip on top of the first and continuing to match and cut strips in the same manner, the cutting operation can be completed quickly.

You'll want to start at a doorway or

corner, but since they are seldom exactly straight, drop a weighted plumb line with chalked string from the ceiling. When it hangs down it establishes a perfectly vertical line. Hold the string tautly and snap the chalked string against the wall, to give you a good vertical line for aligning your first strip of covering.

Now back to the covering you've cut, take a strip at a time, turn it over and apply adhesive evenly, from the center toward the bottom. Leave a one-inch strip unpasted for easy handling.

Allow about three minutes for the covering to expand, then fold the bottom half toward the center, paste to paste, without creasing the covering. Stop short of the center and align the edges.

Follow the same procedure on the top half, folding it over to the center. The one-inch unpasted strip at the top should overlap the bottom edge folded up to the center. You'll follow this procedure with each strip.

To hang the covering, unfold the top section and place the strip oigh on the wall, overlapping the ceiling-wall joint by about two inches and aligning its edge with the vertical snapped with your chalked plumbline. Give the

upper section a couple of strokes with your smoothing brush.

Next, open the lower section and when you are satisfied with the strips alignment, brush the entire surface smooth.

Always brush from the center to the edges to get rid of air bubbles. Trim off excess covering at the baseboard and ceiling and remove any extra paste.

When hanging other strips, use the completed strip as a guide, matching the pattern and butting — not overlapping — the seams. Repeat the smoothing procedure, then roll the seam with the seam roller. For flopped or embossed covering, don't use the roller. Instead, tap along the seams with tips of smoothing brush bristles.

As you complete each strip remove excess paste. With quality adhesives, a damp sponge is all that is needed.

For corners, measure from the last strip to the corner at ceiling level, midpoint and baseboard. Add a half inch to the width, cut a strip to the desired size and hang in the usual way. It will overlap the corner by the extra half inch you measured.

Snap a plumb chalkline over the overlay for use as a guide in hanging the first strip on the next wall. Thus, you'll have a true vertical, even if the corner is not perfectly straight.

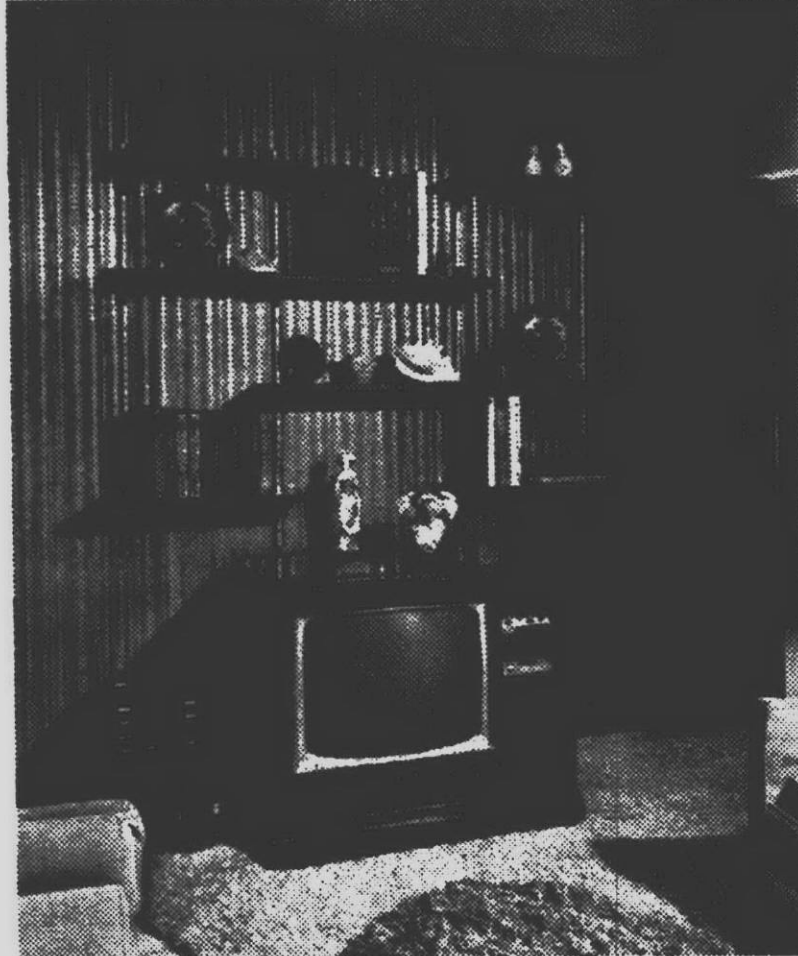

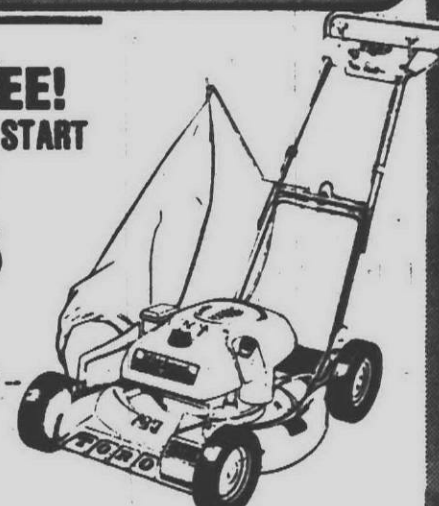

# Gardening can be hazardous

Springtime is a busy time, and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission estimates that some 123,000 accidents occur each year in home gardens. Many of these accidents are the result of careless use of power tools and equipment.

Handling the tools and equipment involved in gardening can be hazardous. Deaths and injuries are reported every year from riding mowers, lawnmowers, trimmers, and other power tools.

The hazards of home gardens that move at over 20 miles per hour and can hurt if they hit a person or a neighboring yard with roots and debris as well as several reports of accidents involving riding mowers and garden tractors. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission offers this safety checklist as a reminder of operators of power mowers:

In-depth investigations of accidents over the past few years reveal two major hazards: accidents associated with riding mowers and garden tractors.

1. Direct contact with moving blades - a chain of grass clogged in the discharge chute has caused many a gardener to pull out a hair or two as

has a quick adjustment while the motor is on. A foot slipping under the mower while mowing on an incline or in tall grass and encountering an obstacle such as a rock has accounted for numerous injuries.

2. Propelled objects - operators, bystanders, children, and neighbors nearby have been severely injured by small pieces of wire, small rocks, stones, and bits of wood and metal shot from discharge chutes.

Many accidents could be averted by careful attention to instruction manuals, proper maintenance and the use of common sense. The safety commission offers this safety checklist as a reminder of operators of power mowers:

- Wear sturdy shoes.
- Never mow when tired or in a hurry.
- Mow the lawn carefully prior to mowing to remove any debris.
- Be sure that others are out of the area before starting.
- Never remove any of the safety guards and shields that should be attached to the mower.
- Use caution when starting the mower. Do not stand in a direct line with the discharge chute.
- Never leave the mower running and unattended.

• Never refuel the mower while it is running or hot. Store gasoline in a safety container away from living areas.

• Never tip or lift the mower when it is running.

• Turn the mower off and make sure the blades have stopped rotating before clearing the discharge chute. Disconnect the spark plug before further maintenance or repairs.

• Wear safety glasses to protect eyes.

• Never permit children to use a mower and supervise inexperienced operators very carefully.

Operators of electric mowers should use brightly colored cords to avoid accidentally severing them. Make certain the machine is grounded and that any extension cord used is the proper gauge. Never sub in wet grass.

Slopes are a major hazard for riding mowers. Operators of riding mowers and garden tractors have been injured and killed when the mower overturns or when the driver or extra rider, sometimes a child, falls off.

Children also have been severely injured when a careless operator goes into reverse without looking behind first.

Power hedge trimmers - both single and double edge - also are convenient but potentially dangerous garden aides. An estimated 8,400 persons required emergency room care last year for injuries that included severe cuts and amputations.

Many gardeners find it necessary to remove the left hand from the trimmer to hold branches away from the cutting blade or to direct branches into the cutting blade and inadvertently injure themselves.

Trimmers often are heavy and unwieldy, and the removal of one hand can limit control and direction. Fatigue, hand cramps, and standing on a chair or box while trimming have all contributed to some reported accidents.

In several cases, the cord was cited as another contributing cause. The cord can limit direction and distance, and accident victims have reported they were distracted while pulling the cord or while trying to keep the cord from being cut.

Consumers who use hedge trimmers or similar equipment should observe the following tips:

• Read instructions. When resting a trimmer, be sure to receive thorough operating instructions and safety guidelines.

• Don't hurry.

• Keep hands out of the way.

• Use the specially designed extension cord connectors so the cord will not

pull out when tension is applied. A belt hook to keep the cord away from the blades also would be a good idea.

When purchasing a trimmer, seek one that is lightweight, easy to maneuver, and incorporates safe design features. Check to see that the position of the forward grip handle is located above and away from the cutting blade. Look for a trimmer with a pressure-sensitive switch that cuts the power immediately when the pressure is released.
