## Lest we forget - Plymouth ready to honor war dead

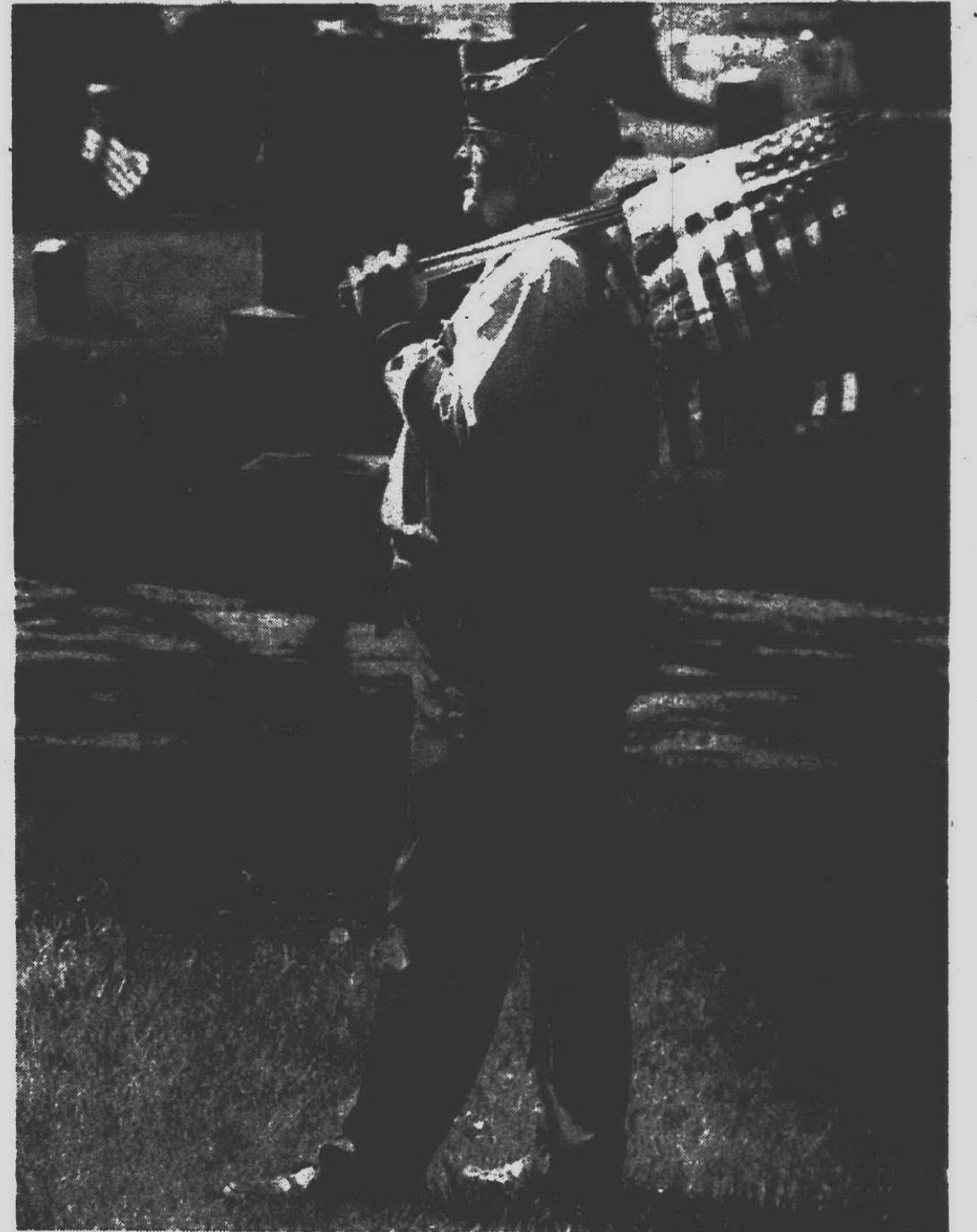


**MEMORIAL DAY SPEAKER** Ernest Stratychuk of Dearborn, a past commander of the Michigan VFW and current chairman of the National Americanism Committee of the VFW, will highlight Monday's parade and Kellogg Park ceremonies honoring Plymouth's war dead.

PLYMOUTH — The Plymouth community will gather Sunday and Monday to pay homage to its war dead. From Sunday morning, when memorial services will be held in Lake Pointe Community Chapel on Schoolcraft Road, until taps are sounded and a benediction spoken Monday noon at Kellogg Park, those who fought and gave their lives in defense of their country will be honored. THE PLYMOUTH Memorial Day observance, in the century-old tradition of a day set aside for a solemn tribute to America's soldiers, will be held Monday, May 27. Services Sunday in Lake Pointe Community Chapel will honor local members of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Flags will be displayed and the veterans invited to sit in designated pews. James McKindles, a member of the Mayflower VFW Post and a World War II veteran, coordinated planning for the ceremonies. On Monday the celebration shifts to downtown Plymouth. Bands from Plymouth Centennial Park, Central Middle School and West Middle School will assemble with members of the Mayflower Post No. 6695 VFW colorguard and drill team and the Passage - Gayde Post No. 391

of the American Legion at 9:30 a. m. at the Central School parking lot. At 10 a.m. the procession will begin making its way down Main Street. Robert J. Sumption of 4055 Gotfredson, a veteran of World Wars I and II and one of Plymouth's senior soldiers, will serve as parade grand marshal. Passage - Gayde American Legion Post Sergeant - at - Arms J. Roger McGonagle will join Sumption as aide to the marshal. At the corner of Main and Church the procession will pause while members of the VFW color guard and drill team march to the World War I monument at Central School for a three - volley salute to fallen soldiers of that conflict. When the VFW units return to the procession the marchers will resume their progress toward Kellogg Park. THE KELLOGG Park program is set for 10:30 a.m., with W. H. Werber, field superintendent of Western Electric Co., as master of ceremonies. Rev. Ross Rainey of Lake Pointe Community Chapel will read the invocation to begin the program. Members of the Plymouth Centennial Park marching band, under direction of James Griffith, will play the national anthem, after which Mayor Beverly McAninch will lead those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Ernest Stratychuk of Dearborn, past commander of the Michigan VFW and 1964 Veteran of the Year, will deliver the official Memorial Day address. Also on the program will be VFW Mayflower Post Commander L. C. Remington, VFW Auxiliary President Mary M. Holdsworth, American Legion Passage - Gayde Commander Robert B. Finley, American Legion Auxiliary President Phyllis L. Hever, Benton Parkway Barracks Commander Cecil Fehrlin and Benton Auxiliary President Gladys M. Ryder. Paul Sincok of 1370 Penniman, a student at Plymouth Centennial Park, will recite "In Flanders Field." Following the recital the Central Middle School band, directed by Mike DiCuirci, will play "You're a Grand Old Flag." Also performing will be Jeffrey Drifmeyer's 150 - member West Middle School band. Members of the VFW drill team will lay a memorial wreath over the Rock in a drill conducted by team Sgt. Harvey Jones. The wreath will be placed by VFW and American Legion commanders L. C. Remington and Robert Finley. The drill team will fire a three - volley salute and the ceremony will end with the blowing of taps by bugler Harry W. Krumm.

## City cuts funding, Youth Inc. future uncertain

PLYMOUTH — As a result of the city commission's decision Tuesday to trim its support of Youth Inc. in half, that organization's fate is uncertain, its leaders say. In close 4 - 3 votes marked by the first real split in this city commission, the requested \$8,000 funding of the youth center was denied and in its place, \$4,000 was given. Since its beginning three years ago, Youth Inc. has received at least \$8,000 as an annual contribution from the city. About 100 persons were in the audience to root for Youth Inc.'s budget request and for a donation request from Our House Crisis Center. Several weeks ago, City Attorney Charles Lowe ruled that the city's past practice of donating money to such organizations was illegal and thus the two organizations' funding was put off until the Tuesday meeting.

Lowe did say in his legal opinion and again Tuesday, that the city could continue to fund such organizations through contractual arrangements although outright gifts are illegal. At the outset of the Youth Inc. budget discussion, several persons from the audience spoke in favor of funding the center's request.

One youth, who said he was once "a very screwed up teenager in search of a path" credited Youth Inc.'s yoga classes and other activities as getting him straightened out. "I feel I've come full cycle," he said. Representatives of the YMCA, Plymouth 4 - H Club and the Plymouth FISH organization spoke in favor of the center.

Edna Terry, of the 4 - H Club's dog obedience group, said Youth Inc. came to their rescue when they couldn't find a place to meet. "Without this facility we would have to disband our club," she said. City Commissioner John Cummings suggested that the club could use the city's cultural center.

"I believe that goes for \$40 a night," Mrs. Terry replied, being greeted by applause from the audience. Peter Humphrey, of the FISH organization, said the youth facility, located in the former Plymouth Mail & Observer building at 271 S. Main Street, extends a welcome hand to other organizations.

"For every dollar you put into Youth Inc., you get another dollar in service from organizations which are allowed to use Youth Inc.," Humphrey said. Commissioner Harold Guenther moved to meet the organization's budget request of \$8,000.

Commissioner Norbert Battermann said, "I'm strongly in favor of Youth Inc. However, I must say that I was somewhat disappointed that there was no money left over this year.

"There seems to be no improvement in Youth Inc.'s handling of funds. Commissioner Joe Bida said, "I'm not against Youth Inc. but I feel Plymouth Township should support it equally." Bida asked for a show of hands from the audience by community. About 75 per cent indicated they were from the city while the remainder indicated they were from Plymouth and Canton townships. Humphrey replied, "The community knows no boundary."

"If they're using the facilities, they should pay for them," Bida countered. Guenther said, "I think we beg the question when we bring the township into it. If we sit here and don't watch it, we'll talk ourselves out of services for our own people." "The township's involvement does not bear on this matter at all — that still does not excuse them (from not sharing in the funding)." *Continued on Page 7A*

## Report shows schools need more buildings

PLYMOUTH — The Plymouth Community School District should build nine new schools in the next seven years. That recommendation comes from a report by a professional planning firm engaged by the school system. Projecting enrollment figures to 1981, the report indicates the district will require three new elementary schools by the fall of 1976, a new high school by 1977, a middle school by perhaps 1978, and four more elementary schools by the fall of 1981.

Enrollment projections and an analysis of current building capacities have been the object of no fewer than four recent studies conducted in the district. The most recent of those, and in some respects the most conservative, has determined that unless those schools are built, by 1981 the district will be more than 7,800 students over its capacity.

THE REPORT, prepared by Alden B. Dow Associates, Inc., a professional planning firm, is partially responsible, school officials indicate, for the decision to go for a 1.29 mill building bond issue in the June 10 school election.

That amounts to nearly \$10 million for three elementary schools and for Phase III of the Canton High School building program which the report recommends be completed in 1976.

Alden Dow planners went into every classroom in the district to assess the actual capacities now available. The study showed that in grades K - 5, Plymouth Community Schools can now accommodate 5,515 students — by next fall, those grades will already be 420 students over their capacity.

Grades six - eight can now accommodate 3,518 youngsters. Those grades are in the best shape — they will not be over capacity until the fall of 1977. This fall there will still be

room for more than 600 extra students in those grades. Though the high school grades nine - 12 now have a design capacity of 4,198, they too are still in fair condition. Next fall they will still (if projections hold true) be able to accommodate more than 350 students over enrollment expectations. However, in two years, by the fall of 1976, the high schools will be more than 150 students over capacity and nearly 500 students past the limit the following year.

THE REPORT goes still further. By the fall of 1981, it projects, if no new buildings are constructed, K - five will have 3,920 more students than it can handle; grades six - eight will be 1,282 students over capacity; and the *Continued on Page 7A*

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# The heat's on Congress

## Roth busing foes scrapping on compromise

School busing opponents have moved their fight off the floor of Congress to the conference committee room, in a scrap to retain the tough House approved amendment which would ban transporting students beyond the second closest school to their homes.

Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R - Ann Arbor), who sponsored and led the House battle to prevent cross-district busing, said he now is concentrating on achieving a binding pledge that House conferees will hold out to the end against a softer version passed by the Senate.

THE SENATE measure retains the second closest school provision but drops a House clause making the legislation retroactive.

It also spells out clearly that the courts can ignore the new restrictions if they find them "inconsistent with the Constitution with regard to the elimination of such vestiges of dual school systems."

"It's difficult right now to determine whether the amendment passed by the Senate will stop the Roth decision," said Esch, whose 2nd District includes Plymouth and Livonia.

Congressmen Ford, O'Hara, Huber and myself are working very hard to make sure that any bill which comes from the conference committee prevents cross-district busing."

Esch referred to the order of Federal Judge Stephen Roth which decreed cross-district busing between Detroit and school districts in three surrounding counties. The Roth ruling is now before the U. S. Supreme Court.

Esch said language of the Senate amendment leaving final determination to the courts is "very vague." It was "put in carefully by Scott and Mansfield" with the intent of obviating the measure's restrictions, he said.

Sen. Hugh Scott is Senate Republican leader and Sen. Mike Mansfield is majority leader.

THE ADMENDMENTS are attached to an extension of the Federal Aid to Education Act: a four year, \$23.7 billion measure as passed by the Senate and a three year, \$18 billion as authorized by the House.

These differences, as well as the busing dispute, now must be ironed out in conference. But the main point of contention is expected to be the busing ban.

Rep. William D. Ford (D - Taylor) agreed in calling the Scott - Mansfield addition to the Senate anti-busing amendment "vague."

"The busing prohibition notwithstanding, it doesn't mean a thing if the Constitution is involved," he said.

Ford, whose 15th District includes Garden City, Westland and Canton Township, described the Esch amendment as "not anti-integration."

"It simply requires that public agencies follow a sequence" before transferring a child from his neighborhood school, Ford said. "It doesn't protect one child's rights and then turn around and take away the rights of another child."

THE ESCH amendment lists seven ways of dealing with segregation that must be tried before any busing could be ordered.

Alternatives include voluntary transfers, construction or closing of schools and revising attendance zones.

Only after all these had failed could busing be ordered and then not beyond the second closest school to the pupil's home.

Ford also said that a "whole variety of little indications" lead him to believe the Supreme Court may rule any day now in the Roth case.

He "just can't see how" the court could uphold Roth, Ford said, but if it does: "You'll probably see a constitutional amendment (banning busing) go sailing through here like a battleship," he predicted.

THE SENATE rejected the House anti-busing version 47-46, and Esch was critical of Michigan Democratic Sen. Philip A. Hart for voting with the majority.

"It lost by only one vote and Hart's vote made the difference."

"I am very disappointed that one of the two Michigan senators didn't see fit to vote for what his constituents believe in very strongly," Esch went on.

"All evidence is that both blacks and whites don't support busing and do support neighborhood schools."

Michigan's other senator, Republican Robert P. Griffin, has led the anti-busing forces in the Senate.

IN ANOTHER reaction, James F. O'Neil, Republican of Livonia and vice president of the State Board of Education has called for Hart either to resign from the Senate or be recalled from office because of his vote.

O'Neil wrote Hart that his action "betrayed" parents and public school children and was particularly "despicable" because of Hart's "hypocrisy" in sending his own children to private schools.

Hart's vote "denied the people of a representative system of government," O'Neil declared, because a Gallup Poll showed 91 per cent of black citizens and 96 per cent of white citizens as disapproving "forced busing of school children for racial manipulation."

Esch said it will be two or three weeks before a conference committee report on the volatile busing issue can be expected.

Should the conference committee negotiations wind up by eliminating or softening the House anti-busing measure, it faces a possible presidential veto.

President Nixon publicly has backed the House anti-busing language. He also is opposed to the Senate's failure to consolidate aid programs, as proposed in the House measure, and to the extra year of funds authorized in the Senate bill.

THE SENATE'S final version of an anti-busing measure came, incidentally, one day before the 20th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision outlawing school segregation.

It followed two days of debate and parliamentary quick stepping by a bitterly divided Senate with neither side strong enough to score a clear cut victory.

The tough bill, modeled on the House-approved Esch measure and introduced by Sen. Edward J. Gurney (R - Fla.), went down to defeat on a 47-46 vote to adopt a measure by Sen. Jacob K. Javits (R - New York) to table it.

The Senate then adopted an amendment introduced by Indiana Democrat Birch Bayh which would have permitted busing within a single school district but only after the court had first determined no other possible alternative would adequately desegregate the system.

Busing could have been ordered between school districts, under the Bayh proposal, only if there were a finding that each district involved deliberately practiced racial discrimination or if it were shown district lines were drawn for the purpose of furthering segregation.

The first vote on the Bayh proposal, offered as a complete substitute for the Gurney amendment, defeated it overwhelmingly, 84-9.

Then came the vote on Javits' mo-

tion to table the Gurney amendment.

The Senate then rejected an amendment offered by Sen. Sam J. Ervin (D - N.C.) to permit all students to exercise a "freedom of choice" in selecting their school.

Bayh then reintroduced his amendment. This time conservatives, who wanted some kind of anti-busing legislation, and liberals from states affected by busing orders joined forces to pass the Bayh amendment.

THE FOLLOWING day, in a move that caught the civil rights bloc by surprise, Sen. Griffin, assistant Re-

publican leader, moved a substitute amendment which contained the same wording as the Gurney proposal but deleted the part making the decision retroactive.

The Griffin amendment passed 47-46.

Scott then stepped in with a substitute, including the Griffin amendment but adding language leaving the courts with the final decision. Griffin's efforts to kill the Scott substitute failed and the measure was adopted 47-46.

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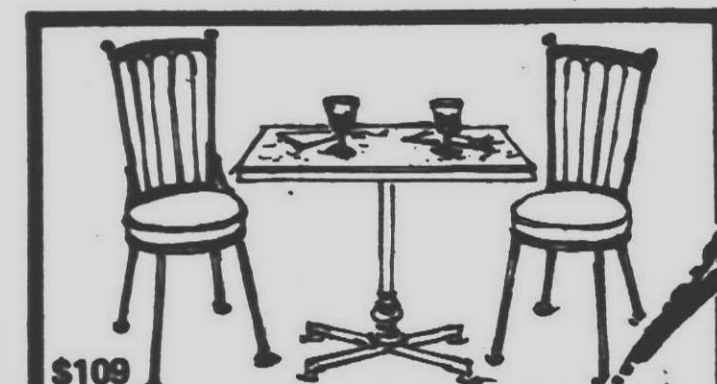
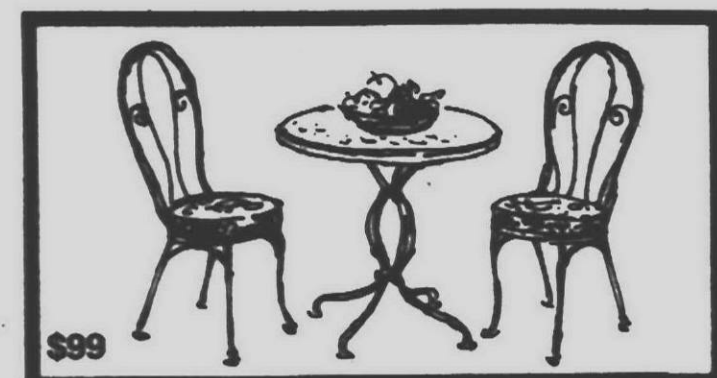
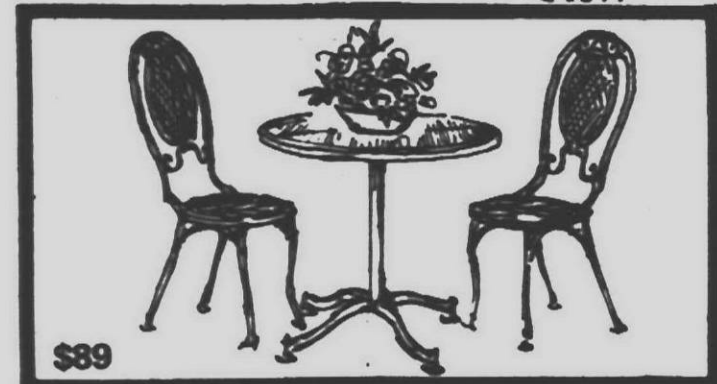


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# 4th, 5th graders compete in track, field day

## Students learn bus safety need

**PLYMOUTH** — Students in Plymouth schools have been made aware of their responsibility as riders in contributing to the safety of school bus transportation.

A series of assemblies was presented in all schools in the district by Barbara Voss and Jack Seward of Eastern and Western Michigan universities.

Throughout the country, the students were told, exposure to accidents is on a progressively rising scale, and a trend of unsafe conduct is increasing among groups of students being transported.

The young people were told they must realize that the driver must concentrate 100 per cent on the road and surrounding traffic conditions. The driver cannot for one instant take his attention from driving because of a disturbance caused by riders.

Where the driver steers the bus is where all the riders go. If it happens to be on a bridge, near an emergency vehicle or approaching a gasoline truck, a slight time lag or a minute distraction of the driver can be disastrous.

The assemblies included slide presentations of train - bus crashes as well as a psychologically developed sound film, "And Then It Happened," to impress on students their need to develop a safe attitude.

They were made intently aware of the need to learn to separate the times to have fun from the times to be serious.

School administrators said evaluations of the students' reactions to the message were sincerely enthusiastic as well as the reaction of administrators and teachers.

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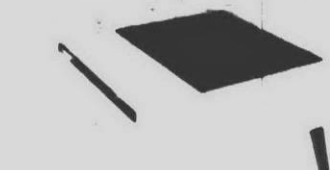
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# Mini bus service may start

A mini transit plan that could help fill a transportation void, has been proposed.

## City OKs Harb's license sale

PLYMOUTH — The Plymouth City Commission voted Tuesday night to approve the transfer of the Class C liquor license owned by Gerald Harb to J. B. D. Inc.

The commission's recommendation approving the transfer will be forwarded to the state liquor control commission which makes the final determination.

Harb, owner of Harb's Restaurant at 860 Fralick, is selling his business to J. B. D. Inc. which is owned by Jack and Donna Neil and Robert Jar-musevich.

The plan, advanced by County Commissioner Brian Arrowsmith (R-Canton), calls for six mini buses capable of carrying 10 to 13 passengers making a two-hour circuit.

The exact route has not been determined, but one possible starting point was downtown Plymouth, Arrowsmith indicated.

Estimated cost of the bus ride would be 35 cents and riders would have an approximate wait of 20 minutes to catch one of the buses.

He said that SEMTA (Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority) would probably furnish the buses.

He emphasized that the plan is in the "promotion" stage and many details need to be worked out. This would be done by a committee made

up of two representatives from each of the 11 communities that might be involved in the plan.

Hopefully, the buses would be in operation by summer, he added.

Initial cost of proposal would be about \$130,000, he said, and participating communities as well as area businessmen, would be asked to consider subsidizing the plan to some extent.

Arrowsmith said the plan would be administered by a non-profit organization and that he planned to step out of the picture as soon as the authority was organized.

The route, possibly bounded by Canton Center Road to the west and Wayne Road to the east, will be determined by the authority, he said.

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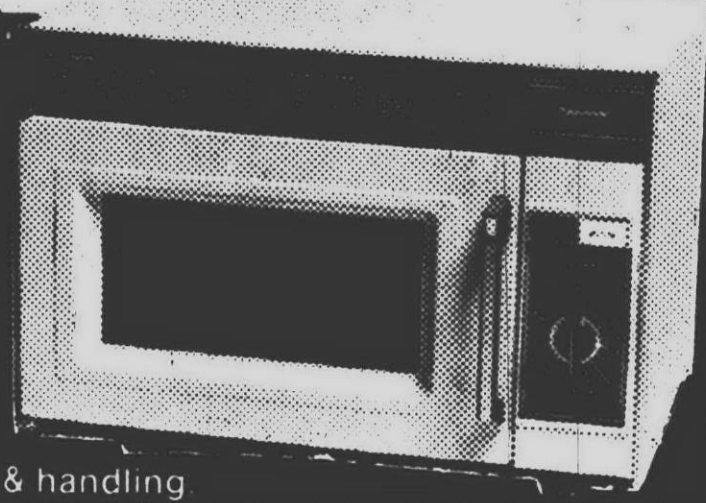
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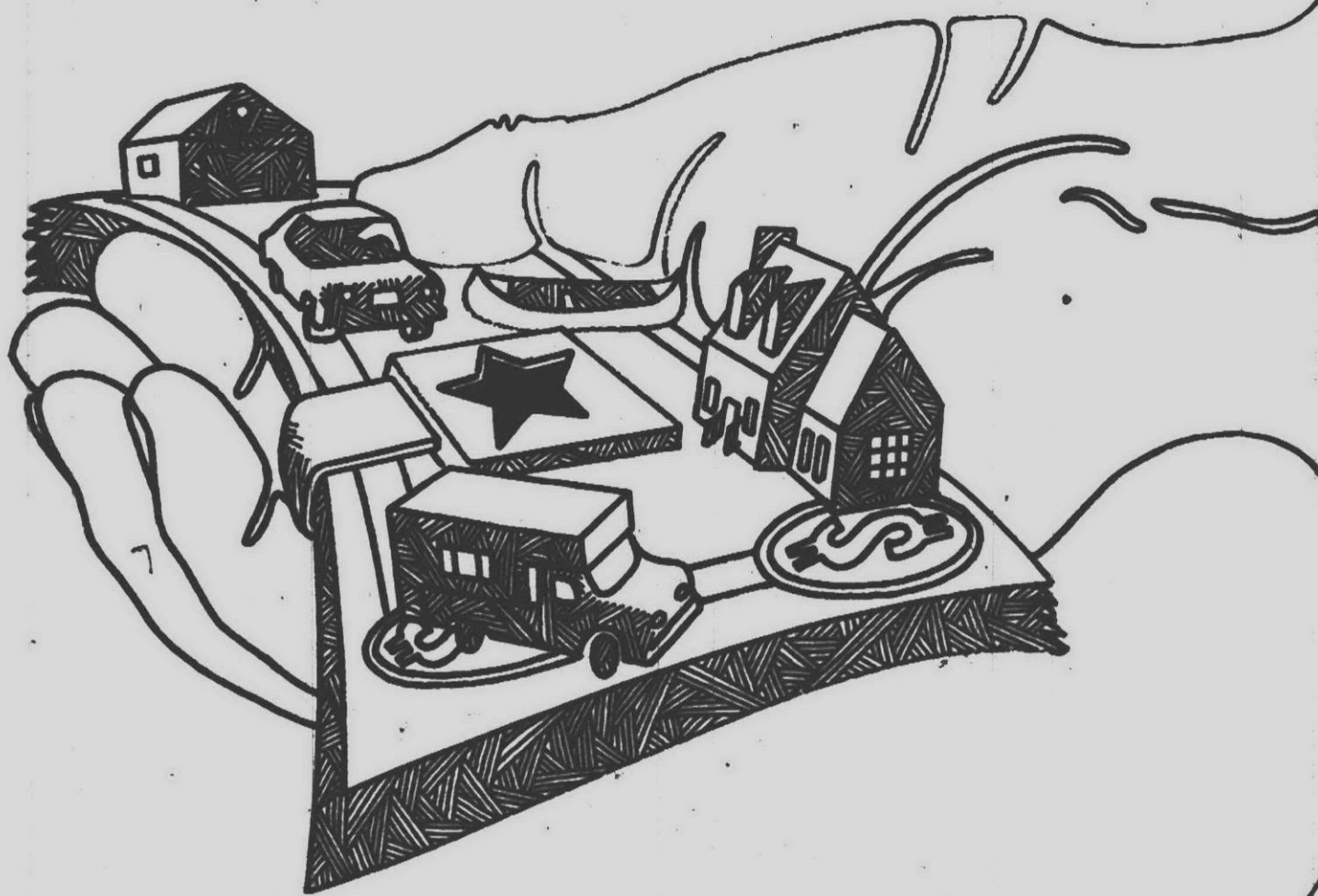

# Report says schools need buildings

high schools will have an excess of 2,626 students.

The report consists of 80 pages of tables, statistics, projections, conclusions and recommendations. It makes use of the enrollment projections done by Wade - Trim planners and of its own extensive building capacity studies before reaching any conclusions.

The figures obtained from two citizen studies conducted earlier are not used. Those figures were even more alarming and in some cases projected enrollment jumps twice as high as

any predicted by the two professional planning firms.

The problem with the citizen studies was apparently that the use of building permits as indicators of the influx of families into the area was not adequate.

Many contractors take out building permits long before anything is ever built on the land. The professional studies, however, used the method of projecting population from occupancy permits, coming up with a more accurate figure.

AMONG THE recommendations planners made to the school board on completion of their study were these:

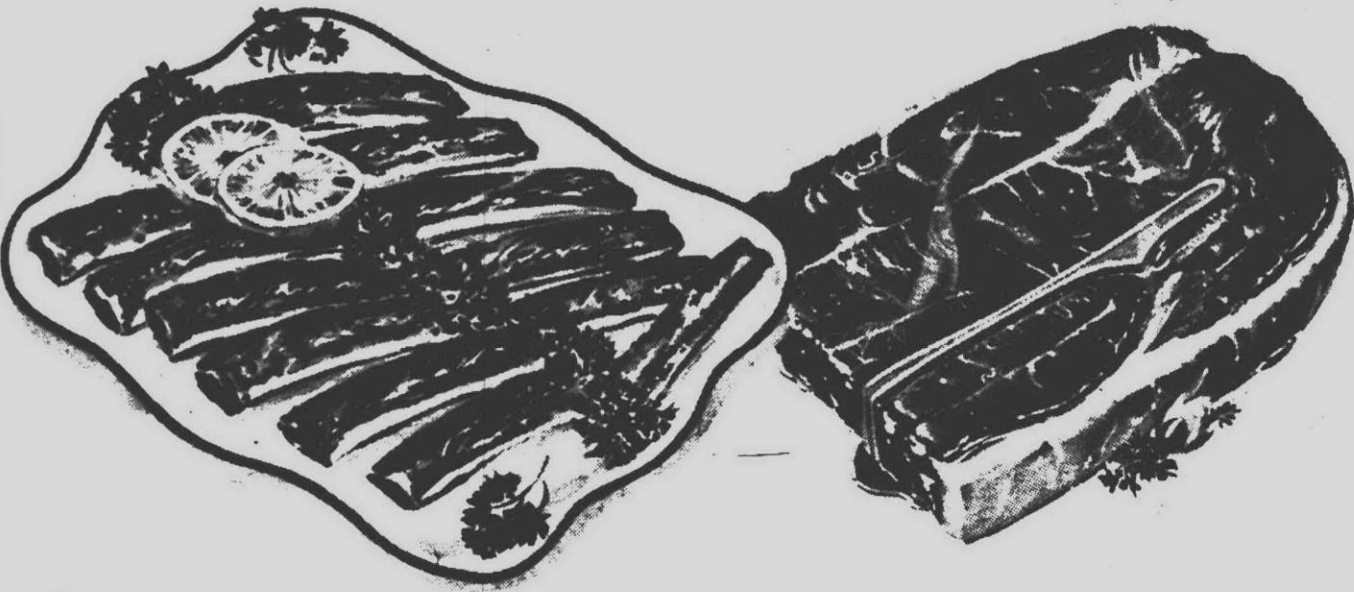
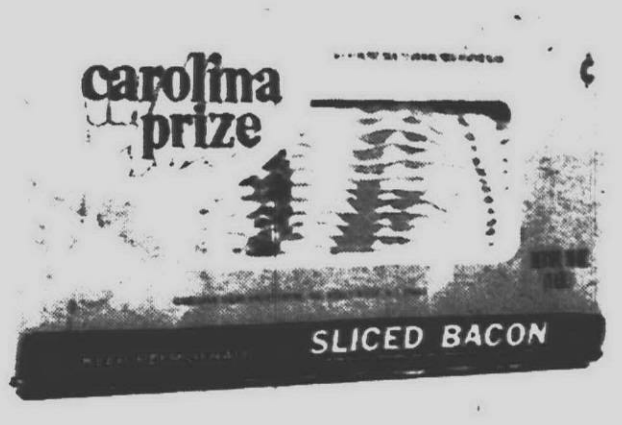
- Construct three elementary schools to be completed by school year 1976, located in Canton Township.
- Construct additional high school facilities - Phase III Canton High School.
- Participate in the state's School Bond Loan Program.
- Sell two existing sites.
- Purchase school sites in Canton Township and other potential growth areas.
- Conduct a facility and site study on the feasibility of constructing an elementary school with a student rated capacity of 900 that may be con-

verted to a middle school as the enrollment and district matures.

- Conduct a total school district master plan reflecting short and long range objectives.
- Develop computer monitoring of enrollment projections, building capacities and site locations on a quarterly basis.
- Review all existing school buildings to determine possible methods of energy conservation.
- Determine needed building renovation and rehabilitation.
- Relocate portables at Central Middle School and cluster for maximum grade utilization.
- Review and analyze building needs for special education.
- Review philosophy of Centennial Educational Park to ascertain physical plant building needs.
- Establish a research center to conduct research and provide information on building requirements and curriculum continuity.

According to Superintendent John M. Hoben, most of those recommendations are already being pursued by the board and administration, some have already been accomplished. Others, however, must necessarily depend on the district's voters. Those will require money.

## Esch requests open debate on reform bill

U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R - Ann Arbor) has joined 22 congressmen to urge an end to secretive and obstructive tactics he says are being used to avoid open debate on proposed reform of the "outmoded committee system" of Congress.

The resolution would provide the first significant congressional reform in 28 years, says Esch whose 2nd District includes Livonia, Plymouth and parts of Washtenaw County.

BY A 111 - 95 secret ballot vote recently, the Democratic Caucus (meeting behind closed doors) rebuffed House Speaker Carl Albert and sent the proposal to a "legislative graveyard where it apparently will be studied to death," he explains.

"Meanwhile, Democratic members in the rules committee have been instructed by the caucus to take no action on the resolution, thus blocking House consideration in full and open debate.

"I was deeply distressed by the caucus vote. Although there appears to be little chance the resolution will be sent to the House floor, despite initial support from Speaker Albert, public pressure mobilized on a large scale could force abandonment of the stultifying unit rule and acceptance of progressive proposals for reform of the House."

The resolution calling for reform was proposed by the Select Committee headed by Reps. Richard Bolling (D - Mo.) and Dave Martin (R - Neb.).

A NUMBER of groups, such as Common Cause, are attempting to generate public support for the resolution. But reformers face solid opposition, Esch says, "from establishmentarians who fear a realignment of committee jurisdictions will erode their power."

One of the reforms would limit a House member to one committee assignment so congressmen can concentrate on one major national policy area and to minimize schedule conflicts.

There would also be a number of jurisdictional shifts to equalize the workload among committees, making it easier to legislate comprehensive policy for a single issue. Esch estimates there are now 25 subcommittees dealing with energy bills.

Other reforms include early organization of committees so weeks aren't wasted at the start of each new Congress in deciding assignments, and a ban on proxy voting.

## Livonia hosts national billiards this weekend

Local champion Palmer Byrd rounds out a field of the nation's top men and women billiard players in the 1974 Billiard News National Open this weekend at the Cushion "N" Cue Billiard Lounge, 27630 Schoolcraft Road, in Livonia.

The open, one of the sport's top national tournaments, will draw a field comparable to that of the U.S. Open and World Tournaments. Twenty men and 15 women will vie for \$7,500 in prize money with \$1,500 going to the winner in the men's division and \$1,000 for the women's division winner.

Ms. Byrd, a 23 - year - old tax accountant in Detroit, has finished the competition in fourth place two years in a row. "I hope to do better in this year's tournament," she says, "because I am improving all the time." Since it is her hometown tournament and is sponsored by the magazine she writes a column for, Palmer kiddingly says she "should have it made."

"But," she adds, "the girl definitely to beat in this tournament is Jean Balukas," Balukas is a 14 - year - old pool wonder who has won the women's division of the U.S. Open the past two years.

Ms. Byrd started playing pool five years ago when she worked as a cashier in a pool room. Since then, she has won the 1971 national amateur championship, the 1972 New England open championship, the 1973 Eastern U.S. open and "lots of seconds and thirds."

She usually spends three to four hours, two or three times a week practicing. Sometimes she goes for weeks without playing. "It all depends on how I feel and what's happening," she says. Many times she is just too busy. Besides being an accountant and writing a column, she works for the Brunswick Corp. doing pool exhibitions throughout the country.

"I am really out to get more women into the game," she emphasizes. "Pool is not a man's game anymore... it is a game of a soft touch, a good eye and clear thinking, and that, I think is something women excel at."

She says the girls are improving all the time because they are just starting to play the game and she feels that someday they will compete right along with the men.

One of the highlights of this tournament is that the women will play concurrently with the men. "When a man brings his wife to the tournament and she sees women playing too, she suddenly becomes interested in the sport," says Ms. Byrd. Since pool is not just a test of strength, both Ms. Byrd and tournament sponsor Ray Abrams believe that women are "the future of the game."

With seating capacity for about 400 persons, the tournament gets under way Friday evening at 9 p.m. with the men and women competing in preliminary rounds. Saturday the different sessions begin at 2, 4, 7, 9, and 11 p.m. Finals in both divisions will start Sunday afternoon and continue through Monday evening. Admission to the tournament is \$3 for the evening sessions and \$2 for the afternoon sessions. A special all - events ticket may be purchased in advance of the competition for \$15.

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# Vegetables on your windowsill

If you have a windowsill, a balcony or a doorstep you have enough room for a vegetable garden.

Vegetables can be grown in containers anywhere they will receive at least six hours of sunlight. The only materials you will need are some containers, soil, seeds and fertilizer.

Any container will work - clay pots, an old pail, a plastic bucket, a wire basket or a wooden box. The size of the container depends on the vegetable you want to grow. Six inch pots are satisfactory for herbs. Radishes, onions and miniature tomatoes need 10-inch pots. Five-gallon trash cans,

or bushel baskets are great for almost any vegetable.

Be sure your container has enough drainage holes. If it doesn't, or if the holes are on the bottom, drill some holes along the side at the bottom of the container.

SPECIALISTS recommend a soil substitute rather than regular potting soil. The soil substitute is a mixture of vermiculite, peat moss and ferti-

zer. It is free of diseases and weeds, holds moisture and plant nutrients well, and is lightweight.

Be sure to choose recommended varieties of vegetables. If you are uncertain what varieties are recommended, contact your local Cooperative Extension office and ask for a list of recommended vegetable varieties.

For a head start on the growing season start your vegetables indoors.

Any type of a flat about the size of a small baking pan is sufficient to start your seeds. Any starting medium such as vermiculite, peat moss, sphagnum moss, or garden soil may be used. Enclose the container in a plastic bag until the seedlings emerge. When the first two leaves are fully developed transplant the seedlings into larger containers.

GET YOUR PLANTS used to the outdoors gradually before moving them out for the summer. To do this, withhold water and lower the temperatures indoors. Tomatoes and peppers cannot be hardened. Wait until there is no threat of frost before putting them outdoors.

Vegetables need the equivalent of one inch of rain per week. When the top one-half of the soil becomes dry it is time to water. During hot, dry weather your vegetables may need water up to three times a week.

Because vegetables need such an enormous amount of nutrients it is important to fertilize about three weeks after your plants have developed their first two leaves and again about every three weeks. Mix the fertilizer into the top one-half inch of soil and water thoroughly.

If weeds appear in the container loosen the soil and remove them immediately being careful not to injure the roots of your vegetables.

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### Choose tomato plants carefully

Those good-looking, big tomato plants already producing flowers and fruit are not necessarily the best buy, says Robert Herner, Michigan State University horticulturist.

Even though they produce early, the fruit will not be of high quality.

The best tomato plants to buy are those four to six weeks old, short and stocky, with healthy green leaves and no evidence of disease, says Herner. Avoid tall spindly plants.

If the plants you bought are already flowered, remove the flowers so the plant will have time to recover from the shock of transplanting before it begins to produce fruit.

Be sure to acclimate your tomato plants to outside weather conditions before transplanting.

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## Grubworms cause problems in lawns

Dead spots and poorly rooted turf in your lawn may be caused by grubworms, say Michigan State University turfgrass specialists.

To test for grubworms, cut a one-foot square flap of grass on three sides and roll it back. If grubworms are present, they will be seen readily in a C-shaped position on the soil. They are off-white in color, have a brown head and measure about an inch long.

Grubworms, the larvae of hard-shelled beetles, feed on the roots of turfgrasses. They overwinter about six to eight inches deep in the soil. In the spring they work their way up to the root system and usually by late April they begin active feeding.

If you find that you do have grubworms, begin treatment immediately. Apply a granular formula of chlordane at recommended rates indicated on the label.

Don't wait until midsummer. By then the grubs are in the adult stage and will no longer be feeding on turfgrass. The damage will be done.

### Follow one-car length rule.

Following too closely is a common cause of auto accidents that can easily be prevented, say auto experts. It's best to allow one car length for each 10 miles-per-hour of speed. When the weather is bad and street conditions are poor, increase the distance.

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# Roses need attention now

Our rose garden has had its ups and downs over the past 15 years. The down years, though, were my fault. When I didn't get out early in the spring to work on the plants.

Just as soon as the buds on the stems start to swell, and before they burst into leaf, is the time to prune and fertilize your roses.

Pruning roses has been one of those dark mysteries over the years, and it shouldn't be. Gardeners in the northern states don't have to worry about pruning; nature does it by killing the plant back each winter to several

inches or a foot above the ground. So, let's take our cue from nature. First, prune out all the dead branches. Then take out those that are weak and spindly that were almost killed off by freezing weather.

WHAT YOU HAVE left are several thick stems that perhaps emerged last year. Cut these back to a foot or so above the ground so the last remaining bud faces out and not in toward the center. That's all there is to it.

There is another thing to look for when you have the pruning shears in hand. Check to see if there is any growth coming from below the bud union. This is the swelling you see on the main stem near the ground.

Any shoots from below the union are coming from the wild rose roots and should be removed all the way down.

IF YOU LEAVE these on, the wild rose will take over and you will be greatly disappointed in the flowers it produces.

Once-a-year fertilizing is sufficient for roses. This should be applied in early spring so that it will be available to the roots when the first surge of growth starts. I usually prune and feed on the same day.

There are special blends of fertilizer for roses, but any good general garden fertilizer with a 5-10-5 formula will work.

When roses start to grow it seems

as if the shoots appear overnight. And, within a week or so the new stems are several inches long. And just when they reach that length, invariably the aphids find them. They seem to appear faster than overnight.

APHIDS ARE PESTY and for best plant growth they should be controlled. Just spraying the affected stems is sufficient, and one of the pushbutton sprays, like Raid Rose and Flower spray, does the job.

The one disease that is also pesty is blackspot. This appears as black spots on the leaf and eventually the leaf turns yellow and dies. You can avoid blackspot by being careful when watering not to wet the foliage. Water close to the ground. This disease can start only when the foliage is wet.

With this minimum care I have roses from June until fall. Mary, my wife, cut the last flower on Oct. 20 last fall.

Q. My neighbor braids the foliage of daffodils after flowering. Is this the proper procedure?

A. Your neighbor was well-meaning in that bulb foliage must stay on until it browns naturally to build a new bulb for the next season. But, tying or braiding the foliage reduces the food-building surface of the leaves and is not recommended. Just let the foliage stay on naturally until it turns brown.

Q. I had a rose that reverted from a large yellow to a small pinkish red. Why?

A. Chances are that your question was answered above. The wild rose took over and crowded out your good yellow one.

## Nibble on your own nasturtiums

If recent publicity on putting flowers in your salad has given you the urge to start nibbling a nasturtium, be sure to use only the flowers you have grown yourself, urge entomologists at Michigan State University.

Commercially grown flowers are often treated with very toxic insecticides, explains Richard Sauer, extension entomology specialist.

The only way to be sure the flowers you eat do not contain insecticide residues is to grow them yourself.

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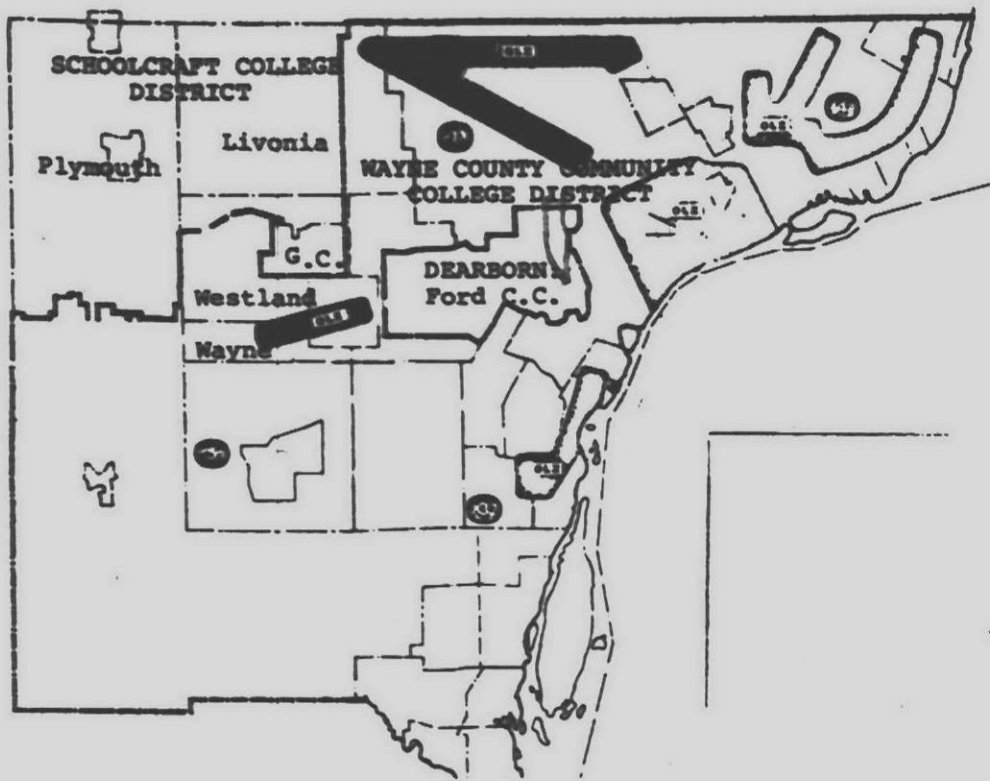
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### Schoolcraft fears drain

Wayne County Community College has a nearly \$74 million building program on the drawing boards that could affect Schoolcraft College.

WCCC planners have divided their district into five regions. No. 1 is northwest Detroit and Redford Township, and No. 5 is the area of the county from Westland southward.

They visualize five campus "cores" with satellite centers. One core —

shown on the map as an "OLZ," or optimal location zone, is the area along Seven Mile and Grand River in Detroit. The other OLZ is along Michigan Ave. in Inkster, southern Westland and Wayne.

Schoolcraft leaders are concerned that WCCC might offer competing programs that would not only lure back its students who are attending Schoolcraft, but also draw Schoolcraft students as well.

# State 'threats' ruffle college

State officials want to see Schoolcraft College do some integrated planning with other two-year colleges in Wayne County. Schoolcraft leaders, however, are a little ruffled about what they consider the state's threatening attitude.

As Schoolcraft President C. Nelson Grote sees it, plans on Wayne County Community College's drawing boards could affect Schoolcraft's enrollment. WCCC is planning campuses in northwest Detroit and in the Inkster-southern Westland areas.

More than 1,000 of Schoolcraft's 8,000 students live in those two WCCC areas. If WCCC offers programs that compete with Schoolcraft's, then the Livonia-based college could lose not only those students but some resident students, too.

Schoolcraft trustees, in a study session last week, gave Dr. Grote an oral go-ahead to participate in the planning process but expressed grave reservations about the way state officials are handling the matter.

WHAT BROUGHT the situation to a head was a Dearborn school board effort to set up Henry Ford Community College as an entirely separate entity from the K-12 school district.

The separation was at first opposed by the State Board for Public Community and Junior Colleges, an advisory group subordinate to the elected State Board of Education.

The state junior colleges board in 1967 went on record as favoring a single community college for Wayne County. If implemented, this policy would eliminate Highland Park and Henry Ford community colleges.

Highland Park officials are already negotiating a merger with WCCC, but Dearborn-Henry Ford's leaders want no part of such a deal.

In a compromise move, the Dear-

born school board agreed to meet with WCCC and Highland Park college leaders to discuss three topics: "1. The elimination of the tuition differential among community colleges in Wayne County; 2. freedom of choice and equality of access among the community college institutions concerned; and, 3. coordination of educational programming to meet the needs of students and the community."

Early discussions involved only leaders of WCCC, Henry Ford and Highland Park colleges and the state advisory board. Now, however, they are inviting Schoolcraft to take part. SCHOOLCRAFT BOARD members aren't against coordinated planning of curriculums; indeed, they see some good coming from it.

What bothers them is the second point — equality of access between students of different college districts. At present, Schoolcraft can practice enrollment favoritism with residents of the college district (which includes the K-12 school districts of Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville and Plymouth).

With "equality of access," however, non-residents of the Schoolcraft College District would have the same opportunity to enroll at Schoolcraft as would local residents.

Money is one chief reason. The Schoolcraft district was formed in 1962, and residents have voted 1.77 mills in property taxes to build facilities and run programs. WCCC voters, in contrast, have repeatedly rejected millage requests.

So Schoolcraft trustees ask: Why should we give "equal access" to programs financed by our tax dollars to non-residents who won't vote their own taxes?

RACE AND POLITICS are also factors.

Schoolcraft trustee Arch Vallier, once a member of the old Wayne County Board of Supervisors, sees a renewal of the "Detroit versus out-county" battles. Vallier sees a "power grab" on the part of the inner city. "This thing has got some politics to it. The hell with the City of Detroit!" said Vallier.

Vallier also saw it as "an attempt (by Detroiters) to get at the tax base of out-county."

His allusions to Detroit irritated other trustees, notably Paul Kadish, Rosina Raymond and Gerald Cox.

Kadish suggested that Schoolcraft "cooperate on program coordination" but wondered why Schoolcraft wasn't invited to planning sessions from the beginning.

Mrs. Raymond saw "a lot of merit to cooperative planning. I get very tired of this purist, isolationist, 'just us' attitude." She compared distrust of Detroit to "southern white" racial attitudes.

Vallier snapped back: "I don't agree with you. My record on the racial question is better than yours... I don't think everything has to be equal. People here in the suburbs wanted something different."

## Reuther urges quicker action on GI benefits

John Reuther, candidate for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 2nd District, has urged U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R - Ann Arbor) to take action to resolve the deadlock currently endangering the GI benefits of thousands of American veterans.

Legislation to extend the GI Bill coverage is stalled by a dispute between the veterans' affairs' committees of the House and Senate.

"The current law is going to expire in less than two weeks," says Reuther, "and 285,000 veterans will no longer be eligible for educational benefits."

ON FEB. 19 the House unanimously passed a bill to provide a 13.6 per cent increase in monthly benefits to \$250 for unmarried veterans. The bill also includes a two year extension of eligibility.

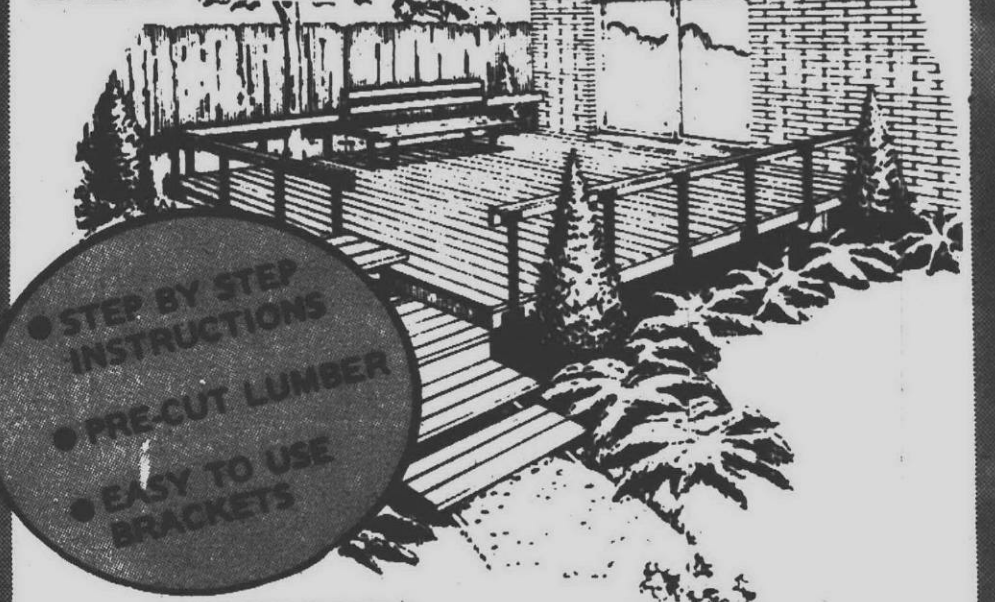
The Senate committee has been considering a bill that would increase benefits 23 per cent as well as extending benefits for two years.

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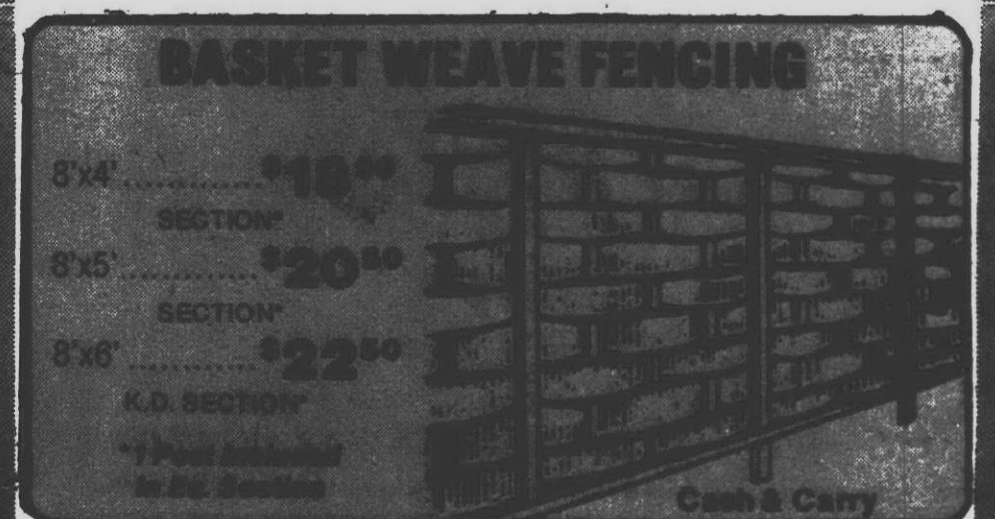
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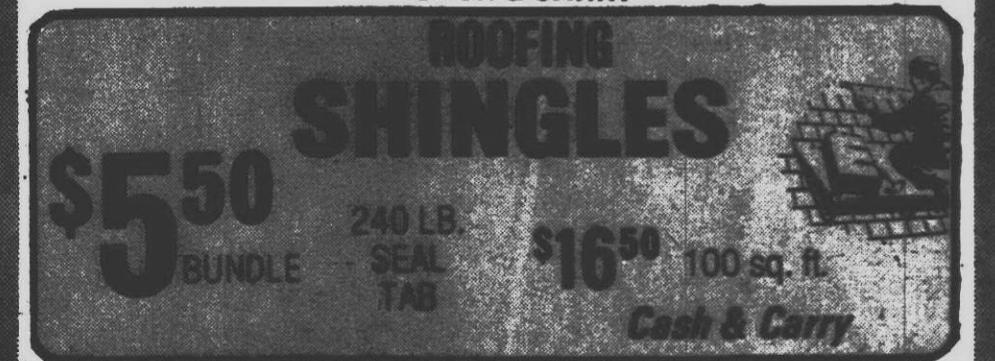

## Quarterly examines arts in schools

The arts — that generation-bridging area of learning — are perhaps the most neglected area of school life, while at the same time being one of the most interesting for students throughout their life, according to the latest Title III Quarterly, "The Arts in the Nation's Schools."

The nine projects described in the Quarterly illustrate some of the diverse ways art is being approached, while at the same time calling attention to the need to capitalize more on the arts while students are in school.

The Colorado Caravan, for example, brings live theater to elementary and secondary students throughout the state. It requires participation of students in workshop sessions following performances ranging from Shakespearean adaptations to Japanese folk tales.

Students do the traveling — to a renovated school in Yakima, Wash., which is designed to stimulate the interest of highly gifted and creative students.

In a St. Paul, Minn. project, former convicts serve as teachers of art to induce interest in art by incarcerated youth in three centers. This project should receive widespread interest from persons concerned with ways and means of reaching youngsters frequently labeled as "delinquents" or "misfits."

Teachers in Williamsport, Pa., are offered inservice activities in an away-from-school skills shop where they refresh their art skills while converting their ideas into curriculum materials.

In another project in Pennsylvania, student interest in photography sparked a Title III project to revamp the approach of a former course for a new look of aesthetics.

Music, an almost forgotten art in many of the nation's elementary schools, is the concern of two projects

reported in the Quarterly. IEMI, a project in Middle Tenn. districts, involves students, teachers, administrators and community in an effort to make music as much a part of the curriculum as reading and math.

In another, students in Jeffersonville, Ind., gain an appreciation of music mainly through involvement in many musical activities — from rhythm and dramatics to musical games and listening and playing instruments.

A Mooresville, N.C. project is helping students develop values along with understanding and appreciation of art, music and drama.

MOPPET, a Title III project in Woodbridge, N.J., has tried to uphold the dual image of fun and freedom while it tackles one of the most "in" concepts in education — humaneness.

It deals with making the school more interesting and open to student creativity, which means that teachers must be more receptive to a student-centered curriculum.

# Schoolcraft prepares for music festival

The eighth annual Schoolcraft College Summer Music School and Festival has been set for July 1 through July 25 on the campus at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia.

The program is open to junior high through college students and will include ensemble playing, school for pianists, class for composers and student concerts.

It also includes concerts and recitals featuring the Schoolcraft faculty String Quartet, Woodwind Quintet and Jones' Consort.

The music school will be in daily sessions Monday through Thursday, July 1 through 25, with the exception of July 4, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Acceptance to the school is based on a successful audition, which is scheduled for May 25. Applications, however, will be accepted through July 1.

Tuition rates are \$44 for students from the Schoolcraft College district (Livonia, Garden City, Plymouth, Northville and Clarenceville) and \$88 for all others.

Tuition doesn't include the cost of private lessons which must be arranged for directly with the teacher. Enrollment is limited to 100 students and college credit is available to high school graduates. Everyone who is accepted to the summer music school will be on a partial scholarship since the actual cost per student is \$160.

This year the emphasis for the music school will be on performance styles of the baroque, classical, romantic and modern periods.

Instruction will deal with the theory, history and performance techniques associated with composers in each of these periods. Public performances by student and faculty ensembles will also relate to these major periods in music history.

The student orchestra will study and perform major works selected for their educational and musical value. The orchestra repertoire will include "New World Symphony," by Dvorak, "Suites," by Bach, "Watermusic Suite," by Handel, "Death and Transfiguration," by Strauss, "Escales," by Ibert and "Symphony No. 104," by Haydn.

Also offered will be four weeks of classes in ensemble performance to talented young players under the direction of artist teachers. Ensembles will include a full orchestra, wind ensemble and chamber music for all instruments. Additional classes will include music theory and history.

A school for selected pianists will provide opportunities in ensemble performance (Beethoven, Mendelssohn, Trios, etc.), two-piano, and piano duet ensembles and concerto playing.

A rare opportunity will be offered to musicians with an interest in composition. Under the direction of Robert W. Jones, composer-in-residence at Schoolcraft, a class of young composers (limited to 10) will meet several times each week.

In line with the overall format of this summer's work, composition will be studied from the four historical points of view - renaissance and baroque, classic, romantic and modern. Each week's work will be a short composition written in the style under discussion. Tonal and formal analysis will be incorporated into the creative story.

All students will participate in regular concerts under faculty direction. Student orchestra concerts will be given on July 18 and 25. Chamber music programs are scheduled for each Thursday morning as well as Wednesday evening, July 24. There will also be an opportunity for an outstanding

soloist to perform in the final orchestra concert of the season.

The faculty's String Quartet and Woodwind Quintet are composed of members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra which includes Clement Barone, flute; Mario DiFiore, cello; Norman Fickett, percussion; Paul Ganson, bassoon; Oliver Green, clarinet; David Ireland, viola; Inez Hullinger Redman, violin; James Tamburini, brass; Eugene Wade, French horn; and James Waring, violin.

Other members of the faculty include Maxim Janowsky, double bass; Robert Jones, theory and composition; David Mariotti, oboe; and Donald Morelock, piano.

Both Janowski and the Jones' Consort are newcomers to the Schoolcraft music school and festival.

Richard T. Saunders is director of the summer music school and festival and Allen Shaffer is assistant director.

Also to be featured during this program will be a rebirth of the Scott Joplin rag and a tribute to the 100th birthday of Charles Ives.

The faculty concerts are scheduled for Tuesday evenings through July and will feature Schubert's "Octet" and "String Quartet No. 3," with soprano solo, an original composition by Bob Jones.

Chamber music recitals will be held on July 2, 16 and 23, and the Jones' Consort will perform on July 9. All concerts begin at 8 p.m. in the college's Liberal Arts Theater. Tickets will be available at the door.

Saunders says the program has always gone over well and the majority of participants are usually high school students. The number of participants is usually 80 and so far this year 60 have enrolled.

## Cranbrook festival features Heifetz

Violinist Daniel Heifetz will join the Kenneth Jewell Choral in presenting Cranbrook Festival '74 on May 10 and 11, at 8 p.m. in Christ Church Cranbrook, Bloomfield Hills.

Sponsored by the Cranbrook Music Guild, Inc., this will be the ninth annual festival of classical baroque music performed in the Gothic setting of Christ Church.

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# What to do at the end of the assembly line?

The other night I got to talking with a Ford styling designer who lives in Birmingham. He was a worried man.

"The costs of raw materials - steel, aluminum, rubber - have gone up so very, very fast that we're going to have to have a whole bunch of big price increases very soon," he frowned.

"Up to now, we've been able to operate on the assumption that most people who buy a car will trade it in every two or three years. But if our raw materials costs keep jumping by 20 or 30 per cent each year, we just may wind up pricing ourselves out of this kind of marketing structure altogether."

Not to mention, my friend, the entire basis of our modern, mass production system of manufacture, which specializes in high - volume, low - cost production of standardized products.

SINCE THE 1920s, the economic base of



most of the western world has been the assembly line.

As a system of production, it has met remarkably well the economic realities of the past 50 years, i.e., that raw materials were comparatively cheap and that the way to make possible rising standards of living without inflation was to have an assembly line that produced standardized goods at very high volume and very low per unit labor costs.

The results have been amazing. Today we can buy a car for a much lower percentage of a family's income than we could 40 years ago. Or a shirt or a pair of shoes. Or almost any other good that can be produced by assembly line methods.

In fact, the system has become so efficient that in many cases - transistor radios are the best example - it's cheaper to throw something away and get a new one than to have it repaired.

BUT TODAY'S astonishing, world - wide inflation in the costs of raw materials may just be signaling the end of all that.

If the cost of the copper and steel and aluminum in a car doubles or triples over the next four or five years, as some economists think may be possible, then the average family will have too much capital tied up in a car to afford to buy a new one every two or three years.

Or if the costs of raw materials make the price of the cheapest transistor radio go to \$20, people are going to start getting their radios repaired instead of throwing them away.

Which, in turn, means that the kind of high volume production which is the basis for the assembly line may gradually be jeopardized.

THE POINT OF all of this is that the basis of our modern assembly line system of production is relatively cheap raw materials, and that this singular economic condition may not last forever.

And where better to start thinking this fact through than in Detroit, which brought the assembly line to our modern world?

The consequences of not thinking in advance about this problem could be just as serious and just as wrenching as the upheavals of the 1920s and 1930s which accompanied the assembly line in the first place.

## The agripolitics of growing grass

A colleague who had covered the political wars with me used to refer to rural township supervisors as the "country slickers." By this he meant that rural folks in their politicking are more adept and more sophisticated than city and suburban dwellers.

He was, of course, absolutely right, and the lesson becomes clear in these warm, wet days of May when our lawns are growing like - well, like weeds.

Consider: Weekly we slave to make grass grow, then we expend more sweat cutting it, then we pay a garbage hauler to take it away. All that we've accomplished is to cultivate trim lawns for our neighbors to look at. The system of lawn growing is silly and ought to be reformed.

WHAT WE SHOULD do is adopt for our lawns the same principles that govern our national agricultural policies. For example:

The country slicker who doesn't want to grow things puts his land in a "soil bank" and gets the Treasury to pay him not to grow crops. There-



fore, a suburbanite who doesn't want to grow grass should receive a similar subsidy; all he gets now is social pressure to conform.

The country slicker pays no tax on the gasoline he uses in his tractor, the theory being that gasoline taxes pay for roads and his tractor isn't used on a road. The suburban bumpkin, however, does pay tax on the gasoline and electricity he uses to operate his lawn mower. He pays sales tax when he buys the mower, too, because it's considered a consumer item and not capital equipment. All of that should be changed, obviously.

THE WORST abuse of the political system occurs in the price structure of the crops.

The country slicker's crops have price supports to assure him an adequate income. Not only does the suburban bumpkin's grass get no guaranteed price, but he can't sell it at all. Certainly, then, simple justice demands that the suburbanite be paid a guaranteed amount for each plastic bag of grass he places at curbside on pickup day.

Moreover, our Land Grant Act colleges should be ordered to make their highest priority item the conduct of research on byproducts that could be made from grass clippings. If multiple products can be developed from peanuts and hog render-

ings, why can't the same be done with grass clippings?

There are many other possible ways for us suburban peasants to begin dipping into the exchequer the way the farmers do, but I think you get the general idea.

The general idea is that grass must be consid-

### Why kids need good counselors

Have you ever wondered why some people work very diligently at their jobs, but hate them and never progress? Then, they finally quit and blossom in some new business.

Chances are that if someone had counseled them in high school, they would have started on the right track in the first place.

Have you ever wondered why teenagers' rebellion against the establishment subsides in the early '20s when they are forced to go out and make a living to raise their own families?

If someone had counseled them about the big, wide world early in life, maybe they wouldn't have rebelled.

IN BOTH CASES, life would have been more satisfying if they had had someone to talk to during their formative years to help them prepare and adjust for later life.

Over the years, sophisticated counseling systems have been introduced into the schools. But too often they are understaffed and deal only with the kids who get into trouble, or else the slots are filled by people who have not been trained in true counseling.

The most important thing in life is self - satisfaction.

Self - satisfaction usually comes from maximizing one's capabilities.

But every boy and girl is different, and to expect all people to be prepared for future life by following the same curriculum ignores the fact that all men are not created equal.

Even if a youngster doesn't think he needs guidance and counseling, it should be part of his educational experience. All students should be tested, not just for their IQ, but for their aptitudes, so that a fine mechanic is not steered into a major in poetry or a potentially fine architect doesn't get himself caught in pre - med because his father is a doctor.

COLLEGE COUNSELING in high school should be a true matching of students' talents with programs offered, not a desire by a school to place a lot of graduates in big - name institutions.

They say the only thing constant is change. The world is having trouble coping because change is coming so much more rapidly than in the past. Coping is even more difficult if you are doing a job that you either can't handle or don't like.

Educators will say that school systems can't afford this type of counseling which is customizing education, but the real question is whether we can afford not to offer it.

### A new holiday traffic hazard

However, since it is the first long weekend holiday of the year and the one in which most folks with summer cabins move necessary items, there isn't any question that traffic will be at the highest level thus far in 1974.

Whether it will equal the totals of past years still remains a question... it's hard to predict how many will be on the highways with gasoline prices so high and the chance of running into a shortage in some spots.

The State Highway Commission is doing its part to make the weekend delightful for drivers. It predicts traffic will be lighter than a year ago when cars traveled 707 million miles on the long weekend.

A halt has been ordered to all but emergency construction and maintenance work on state high-

ways. The order applies to movement of heavy construction equipment on or near state highways.

AND TO MAKE motorists happy, the Chevrolet division of General Motors will suspend shipping operations on the Saginaw River during heavy traffic periods, thus reducing the number of openings of the I - 75 Zilwaukee bridge near Saginaw. And for those who have been pinned in long lines of traffic when the bridge swings up, this is like getting pennies from heaven.

Motorists on I - 75 between Birch Run and Bay City will encounter some inconvenience from construction now under way. All lanes of northbound I - 75 between these points will be open Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday. All southbound lanes will be kept open Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

There are other detours on state highways but generally it will be a long weekend of fun if all follow the safety rules and keep well within the speed limit. Remember, the life you save may be your own.

## Vietnam was a real 'war' except in political arena

This week preceding Memorial Day seems fitting time to reflect on the Vietnam "War" and its great cost to the nation. While considering the cost, we also ought to weigh what we owe - the least of which should be some honor for those killed in action.

Although this debt might seem very obvious, it is not so among all our cities or all persons. The most direct case in point, perhaps, is Livonia which has had some controversy over the naming of a second veterans' park.

Some daring soul had suggested the park be named after Craig Dix, a Livonia resident who continues with the designation "Missing in Action." Surprisingly enough, that suggestion was hotly debated among the veterans groups in Livonia.

THE WINNING side has suggested the park shouldn't be named after a soldier who served during the Vietnam era because it was a "conflict," not a war. The idea seems to be that veterans' parks should be named after soldiers killed in wars, not in conflicts.

Vietnam (in case you haven't been told) is said to be a "conflict" because it was never officially declared a "war" by Congress. The greatest honors, the argument goes, should be saved for those who died "in the great war," which is defined as World War I or World War II depending on your age.

That is the narrowest possible definition of war

that can be contrived and is so ridiculous that any rational man ought to cast it aside as mere rubbish.

The Vietnam WAR, after all, cost this nation \$30 billion which is a huge cost to absorb for a mere conflict. This bill is higher than either WWI or WWII. From a materialistic standpoint alone, Vietnam's cost is sufficient to be called a war.

Secondly, and sadly, the Vietnam WAR resulted in thousands of American soldiers being killed in battle and thousands more injured and maimed for life. From a moral standpoint, surely we must have it within us to admit Vietnam was a war.

From a logistics standpoint (for any of my readers who might be retired generals), there were tons of bombs dropped on Vietnam, all types of anti - missile and other artillery pieces maneuvered, and massive air raids, ship movements, and infantry engagements - bunkers and all.

By any definition, Vietnam was a war - except one: Congress never officially voted a "declaration." But a heavy price has been paid in blood, dollars, and in the spirit of the American people. If it wasn't a war, it was one monstrous conflict and, as General Westmoreland would certainly say, "Conflict is hell."

Metroparks in western Wayne County are preparing for the avalanche of

visitors during the Memorial Day weekend.

Lower Huron metropark near Belleville, one of the most popular, will offer many recreational facilities. The swimming pool is scheduled to open Saturday, May 25 and continue daily through Labor Day, Sept. 2. Pool hours are 9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Hours will be from 10:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

There is a 25 cent per person charge which includes the use of the pool, heated showers and bathhouse. All patrons are required to shower prior to pool use. Coin-operated lockers are available at 25 cents per locker.

Lifeguards are on duty for all swim periods. There is a first-aid station, restrooms, food service. The food bar hours are the same as the pool schedule.

Facilities include a paved parking lot, the Woods Creek picnic area, shuffleboard courts and a tot lot for children two through six.

The park also has an 18-hole "par 3" golf course, nature trails, seasonal nature center, several large picnic areas with tables, stoves and play equipment. Picnic groups of 50 or more are requested to register in advance at the park office. Reservations for picnic areas are not available.

The 1,200 acre park entrance is on Haman with access via the Haggerty interchange along the I-94 freeway between Detroit Metropolitan Airport and Belleville.

Entry permits are \$5 for the annual permit or \$1 for the daily ones. They are on sale at the park office. Park hours are sunrise to 11 p.m.

Willow Metropark, a ninth park, offers only limited picnicking. A swimming pool, and games complex are now being constructed and will open next year. The entrance is on Willow near the Village of Willow between Waltz and Huron River Dr.

Oakwoods Metropark near Flat Rock is not open. Preliminary construction of a major nature center, nature trails and picnic areas has started with opening of the 1,711 acres planned for sometime in 1975.

**Livonia Jaycee festival under way**

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# Operation garage door beautification

Livonian Norman Laich has an idea for brightening his community and paying his way back to art school. He painted the one on his family's

garage on Angeline Circle in a bright whirl of red and green and blue and black arrows, and he's showing another sample of his work in brown tones on a garage located at Joann and Ann Arbor Trail.

"I figure there are thousands of garages in Livonia," he he said, "and painting the doors would give the homes more individuality."

**NORM, A 1973 GRADUATE** of Churchill High School, has worked on murals both in Lowell Junior High and in Churchill.

He wants to make art a career and has studied one semester at the Detroit Society of Arts and Crafts.

"I ran out of money after the fall semester," he said, "and when I go back to school I'd like to attend Sheridan College of Art and Technology outside Toronto."

**HE CONSIDERED** spending this summer painting murals and does have a commission for a group in Plymouth, but then got thinking about garage door painting and tried it out at home.

"I use an overhead projector to block in the design at night, and then do the painting in the daylight hours," he said. "That way the work goes quickly — I don't have a lot of figuring to do."

His work is a super-graphic kind of design with large bands of color.

But he's open to the ideas of those who might hire him to add a touch of class to their backyards.

"I HAVE A BOOK of designs to show," Norm said, "and I'm adding to it all the time. I'll work with people and try to get the kind of design they would like."

Norm said he would be glad to do objective paintings on doors, but "I'd

like to stay away from the Snoopy and Peanuts kind of thing."

**DURING JULY** he will take time off from door painting to paint four murals on a long wall of the Penn Theater in Plymouth.

"I've been working in collaboration with Margaret Wilson, the theater owner, to decide on the kinds of scenes they'll be," he said.

"We've decided on four scenes, one from 'Gone with the Wind,' one from 'The Wizard of Oz,' one from a 2001 Space Odyssey' and one from a John Wayne picture. They will decorate the long outside wall that leads back to the parking lot."

He plans to use the overhead projector to sketch those too.

Norm's charge will be \$50 to \$75 for a single garage door and \$75 to \$100 for a double door, "depending on the complexity of the design and the number of colors."

**THE LAICH MURALS** still part of the scene in Lowell and Churchill are of widely varying design.

At Lowell, he said, he painted a "social commentary on racism." "I guess maybe that was pretty heavy for junior high," he added.

Murals began at Churchill he described as "objective kinds of art, mainly forms and shapes."

## Return hospitality planned

Returning hospitality on a grand scale is the current project of women in Cooperative Extension Service groups in Wayne and Oakland counties.

Nearly a hundred of them journeyed to Pennsylvania last summer for a visit with the women in Pennsylvania Dutch, Mennonite and Amish country.

Now they are preparing to welcome a like number of their counterparts and show them the Motor City and its suburbs.

**THE TRIP BY BUS** in 1973 represented an experimental project for the cooperative extension sponsored by Michigan State University and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In Pennsylvania the organization is called the Farm Bureau Women.

The women from this area spent two days and two nights in the east, staying in homes of Farm Bureau members and visiting interesting spots in the area.

"The basic idea was to learn about the way of life for the Amish, the Pennsylvania Dutch and the Mennonites," said Mrs. Deloures Comiskey of Inkster, who enjoyed the trip last year and is one of the hard-working planners of the upcoming visit from last year's hostesses.

**ABOUT 100 WOMEN** and 10 men are planning to come by bus for a four-day, five-night visit beginning Wednesday, June 4.

And by the time they leave June 9 they'll be a much-traveled, well-informed crew, judging by the schedule that's being lined up for them.

Others from this area on the extension Pennsylvania planning committee include Elaine Shipe of Livonia, helping arrange housing, Norma Douglas of Westland, chairman of the program committee, and Dorothy Love of Westland, also working on the program.

"We sent them a list of possible things to do in this area," Mrs. Comiskey said, "and do you know what their first choice was? They wanted to see 12th Street, because they had read so much about the devastation during the riots and the rebuilding since then."

As things are working out, the problems of one-way streets are preventing a ride down 12th as part of an extensive bus tour of Detroit.

"It goes the wrong way," Mrs. Comiskey said. "But we'll go down 14th, so they can see the area."

**ALSO ON THE BUS** tour will be visits to the New Center area, Wayne State University, the library, the art institute and historical and an ethnic dinner in the International Institute, complete with program by members of the Polanise Society.

"After dinner we figure there will be plenty of daylight left in early June," Mrs. Comiskey said, "so we'll go on through Hamtramck and then to

the Farmers' Market, and then to Belle Isle, and over to Canada through the tunnel and to and then back by the Ambassador Bridge and out Jefferson past Fort Wayne."

Mrs. Comiskey, Mrs. Douglas and Mrs. Marian DeRemer of Taylor are serving as tour guides and commentators for the bus trip.

"We're really studying up on information about the places of interest, and I'm taking along a thermos of water," Mrs. Comiskey added.

**ALSO PART OF THE VISIT** will be time at Greenfield Village and the Ford Motor Co. Rouge Plant and tours of the Detroit Zoo, Meadow Brook, Cranbrook, Kirk of the Hills and the lake area in the Oakland County portion of the touring.

A drive along the length of the Hines Parkway will be included.

"So many of the women here want to go along on the whole tour that we're chartering an extra bus for them," Mrs. Comiskey said.

**THE EXTENSION** women here are especially anxious to make the east-erners' visit one to remember, she said, because they so much enjoyed the generous hospitality extended to them last year.

Highlights of that experience, she recalled, were tours of the city of Reading and a mushroom farm and canning factory, a visit to Stokesay

Castle, a local landmark, and an extraordinary stop at a private home "loaded with American antiques."

"It's a home hardly ever visited by outsiders because the contents are so valuable," Mrs. Comiskey said. "We were asked not to touch anything and we were very careful, but we did an awful lot of copying and sketching."

**THE MICHIGAN VISITORS** also were treated to an Amish meal, "cooked by the Amish women and served by the men" and they had ample opportunity to talk to the people of that sect and learn more of the reasons behind their ways and customs.

For instance, Mrs. Comiskey said, "They explained to us that they don't use buttons because in the old country they connected buttons with uniforms and uniforms with military authority and that authority is what they reject."

Mrs. Comiskey isn't sure whether she'll have two or five visitors staying at her house next month — "if it's five a couple of us will be sleeping in the trailer."

The last word, though, is that a few more homes are needed for visitors from the east.

## Westland Festival planners will send out for food

Hopes to bring the delights of ethnic home cooking to the taste buds and stomachs of those who attend the Westland Spring Festival in Jaycee Park May 25 to 27 have been dashed by the cruel realities of life.

A combination of insurmountable cooking problems in the multi-purpose arena forced the members of the food committee to lower the sights in their aim to make use of ethnic recipes sent them by Westland chefs.

But faced with the difficulties of food preparation plus drainage and health considerations in a building basically an athletic structure, they decided the whole scheme wouldn't wash.

With regret they were forced to abandon suggestions sent to them for beef stroganoff, kielbasa and Hungarian goulash, which they had planned to feed into a computer to magnify that "pinch of salt" into enough seasoning for 2,000 people.

"What do you do if you make enough beef stroganoff for 2,000 people and it rains?" asked Gail McKnight, publicity chairman of the event.

Clearly the situation would call for a great many soggy doggie bags.

What they did is what many harried housewives do when faced with cooking up a storm. "Let's send out for food," the committee decided.

"We found we could do this more cheaply than we could make it ourselves," said Mrs. Sandra Weed, committee chairman. "Then, too, we could purchase it on consignment - refrigerator trucks will be brought to the site - and not have to pay for what we don't use."

She thought it a pity that such mouth-watering recipes as Irish stew could not be created on the site by the cooking committee.

"But what would we do if a thousand more people showed up than we expected," she said. "It would take an hour to cook up a new batch."

While the area is not equipped for cooking, arrangements can be made there for warming the food, she explained.

"The difficulty in cooking in large amounts plus the necessity for keeping prices down led the committee away from its elaborate cooking plans," said Mrs. McKnight.

Nonetheless, it appears that everyone in Westland willing to spend \$1.25 for dinner will eat well over the weekend.

Saturday night they can enjoy Polish ham, cole slaw and baked beans. On Sunday the piece de resistance will be chicken chow mein over noodles plus almond cookies. You can't hardly get more ethnic than that.

French dip beef sandwiches with hot au jus sauce on a hard roll should please not only the male members of the committee who wanted something "they could sink their teeth into," but the entire city as well.

All dinners will be served between 4 and 7 p.m.

A pancake brunch will be on Sunday between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. with pancakes, sausage and a beverage for \$1.

SHE EARNED a degree in education from Eastern Michigan University and taught for six years in the Redford Union district.

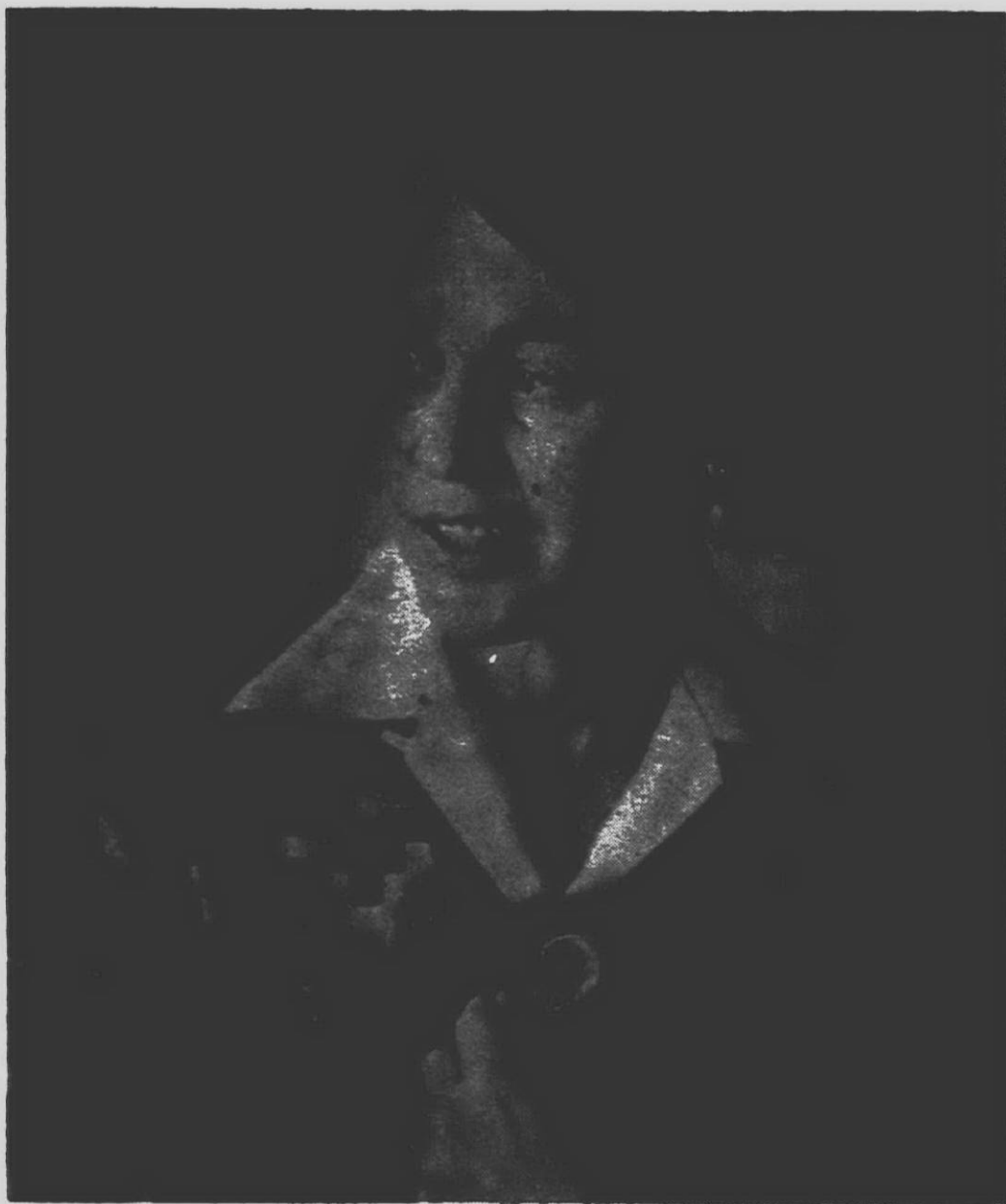
"BUT BASICALLY I'm the original

## New concept in services to retarded announced

A new concept in services for Wayne County's mentally - retarded, ranging from diagnostic examination for children to sheltered workshops for adults, is being announced today (May 23.)

Three new county agencies have been formed, and their leaders will be introduced and their programs defined in a public reception scheduled at 8 p.m. in McAulay Auditorium on the Mercy College campus, 8200 W. Outer Drive, Detroit.

The agencies are the Wayne County Referral Center, the Wayne County Associations for the Retarded and the Wayne County Center for the retarded.

ALL WERE FUNDED for the first time late last year by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners and the Michigan Department of Health through the Detroit - Wayne County Community Mental Health Service Board.

They are designed to provide full

services, free of charge, for all mentally - retarded residents of the area.

The Referral Center, headed by Gregory D. Owen, executive director, will emphasize service for those under 26 years of age.

Of service to residents over 26 will be the Associations for the Retarded. The Center for the Retarded is to provide services for mentally - retarded residents of all ages with a special emphasis on helping clients find an active and productive way of life within the community.

OWEN SAID all three agencies would be able to refer clients to private sources, such as doctors or special living facilities, with the fee based on ability to pay.

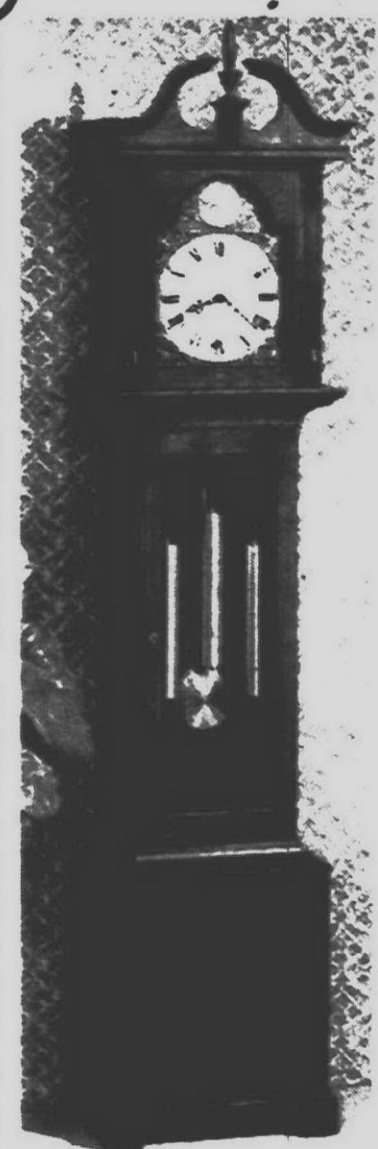
"No one will be turned away when they come to us for help," he stated. "If someone is not eligible for help through our agency, we will make a contact for help through the appropriate source."

SEYMOUR E. SIMONS, executive director of the Wayne County Associations for the retarded, said the retarded in the county number 78,000, or about three per cent of the total population.

"Many are capable of becoming self - supporting, both economically and socially, if they receive adequate services such as specialized training and vocational preparation," he said.

"Others are capable of becoming partially self - supporting. Now, through our programs, we believe mentally - retarded adults have a better chance to work, to be productive and to reach the heights of their own abilities."

HOSTING THE RECEPTION to launch the new program will be Kelly Burke of WXYZ television.



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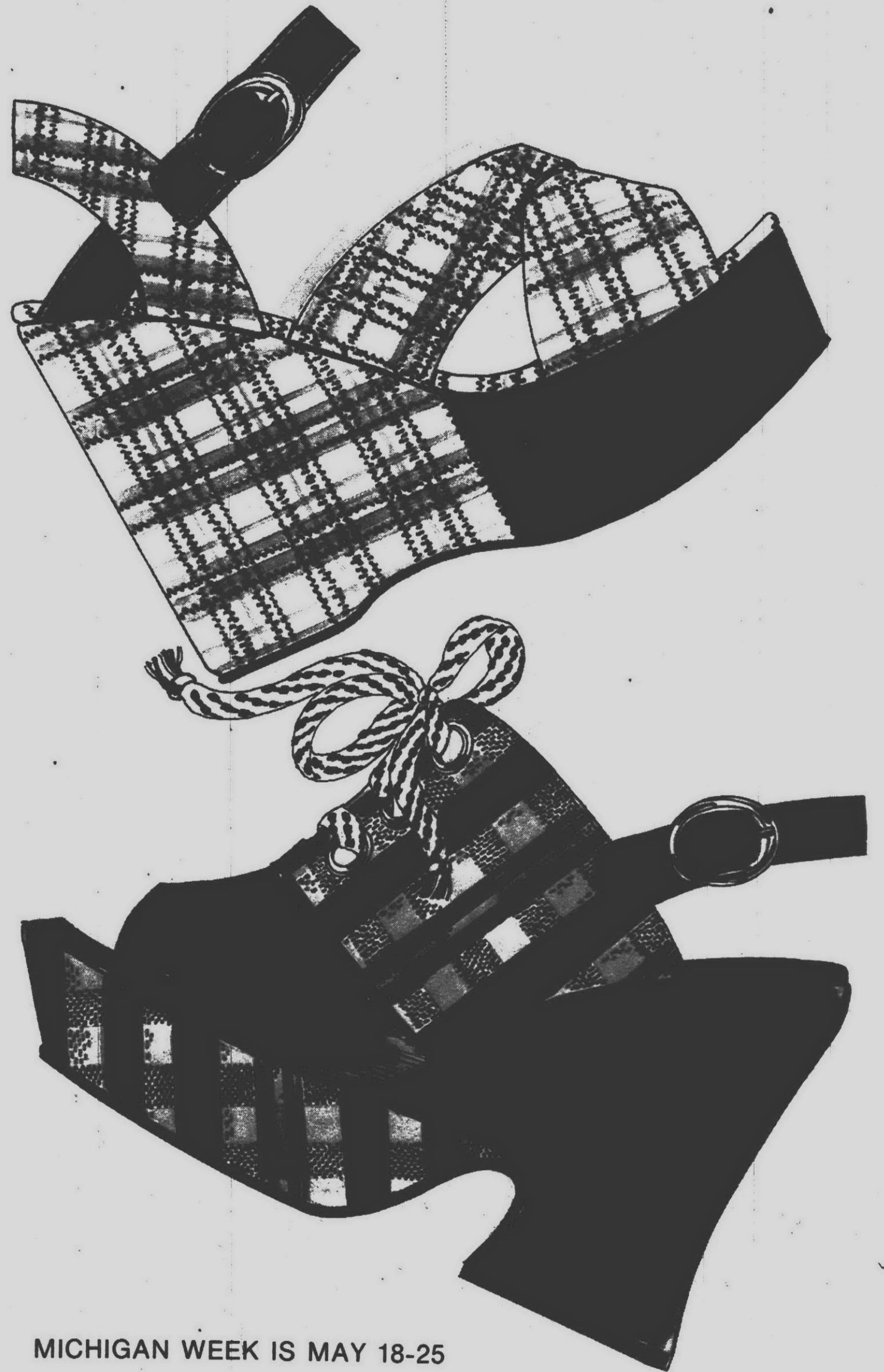

# Walk features restored home

Along with being a fine example of mid 19th century architecture, the Plymouth home of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Sellers, 760 Burroughs, has furnishings befitting an art gallery.

The home is one of seven on the Plymouth Symphony League's house walk, Thursday, May 30.

Ann and Don Sellers, who own the Plymouth Art Gallery, had been looking for a long time for just the right home to restore and furnish.

On her first visit to the house, Mrs. Sellers was convinced. One look at the broad oak beams stretching the width of the attic, the spacious dining room, the gracious stairway, the paneled study — the total 16 rooms and she knew she had found her house.

Ever since they moved in last September, the couple have been working on the house.

Removing wallpaper, changing windows, installing paneling, painting and finding the appropriate furniture, have been a long, hard labor of love.

Mrs. Sellers says as she walks through the newly painted home: "We did all the work ourselves. When we said we wanted to restore an old house, we meant we wanted to restore it ourselves."

The house was moved about 1920 from the place where the Bentley Clinic now stands to its present site. It was one of two houses on a farm that stretched from Main Street to Lilly Road. The other, also moved, is about two blocks south on Burroughs on the other side of the street.

The Sellers home was built by Bethuel Noyes who bought the farmland from Walter McFarlan in 1825. Some estimates put the construction date around 1830. Mrs. Sellers thinks it was between 1840 and 1850. It is put together with wooden pegs. For a period of time, it served as a two-family home, but the previous owner converted it back to one family.

Visitors next Thursday will find much inside to capture their attention. The Sellers are antique and art collectors, some pieces are family heirlooms, others have been acquired. Both, at one time worked for the J.L. Hudson galleries before opening their own.

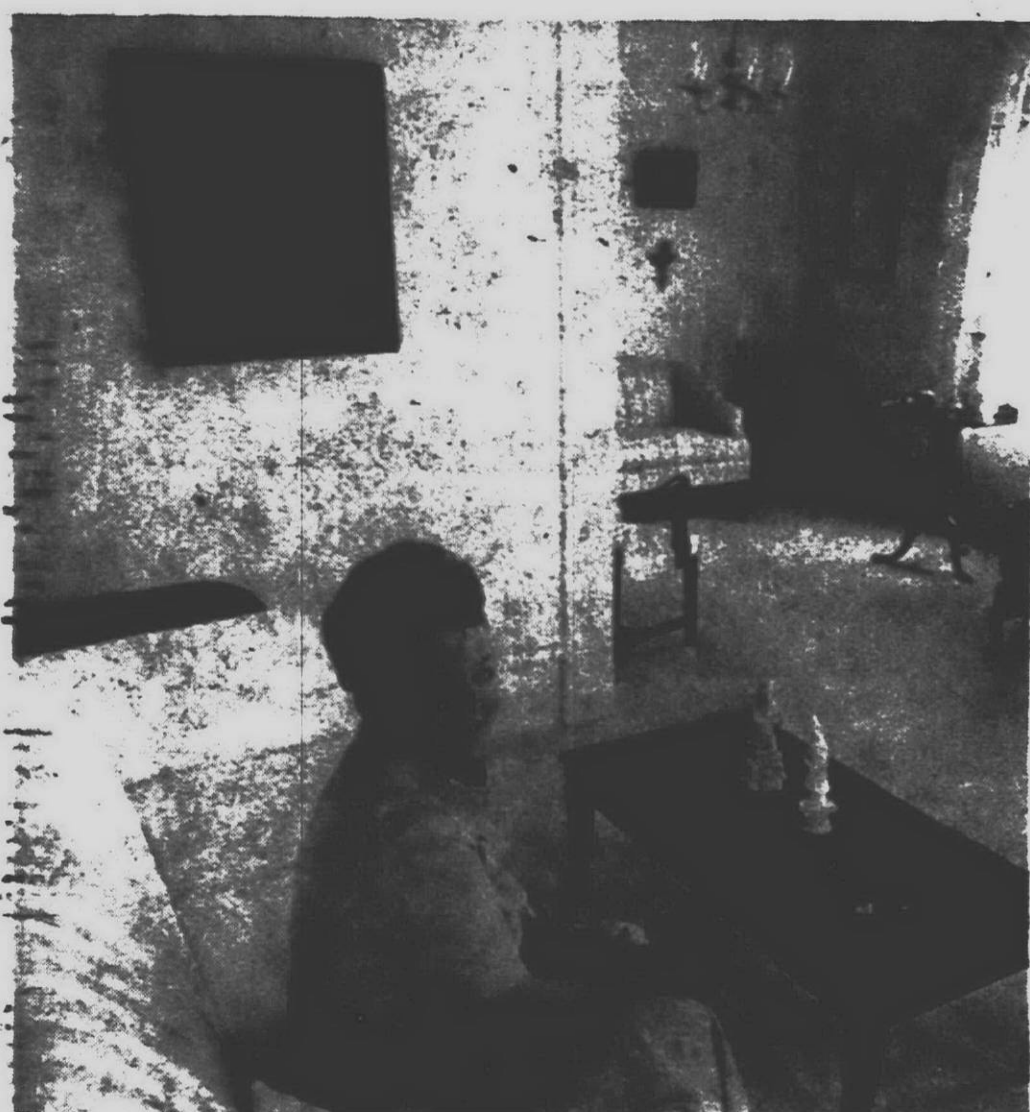
In addition to the major pieces of antique furniture, Oriental rugs and an impressive collection of paintings, there are small collections that are little jewels in the spacious interior.

Sellers collects snuff bottles, carved lapis lazuli being a special favorite. Mrs. Seller's collection of porcelain is displayed in the archway leading to the living room. A spatterwork collection is on a shelf in one of the family rooms. The front parlor houses a fine collection of African carvings and displayed throughout the house are Chinese pieces, teakwood carvings, cloisonne and porcelain.

After searching for dining room chairs and table which would not be lost in the big room, a beautiful set was acquired at the Glancey estate auction.

Paintings run the gamut from American primitives to contemporary. Mrs. Sellers is not afraid to combine contemporary art with period furniture. There are a number of oils by Douglas Arthur Teed, an American who at one time worked in the Detroit area. Teed was fond of painting Arabic scenes in a flowing, impressionistic style.

The Sellers have three grown children and two grandchildren. Theirs is a family that likes to gather together, a family who will make good use of a large, old, elegant home.

## Plymouth-Salem seniors drop baccalaureate

No baccalaureate service will be held this year for the graduating seniors of Plymouth-Salem High School.

Instead, churches in the Plymouth and Canton areas will be encouraged to schedule special services honoring graduates on Sunday, June 9, and members of the class will be encouraged to participate.

Tom Marks, president of the high school's senior class, and Jeff Ziel, vice president, said the decision was made by the class through its elected officers because "there appears to be no overall interest any more."

Court decisions banning prayer in school also had a bearing on the decision, the class officers added.

MARKS EXPLAINED that last year the senior class, numbering about 750, had been polled to determine the amount of interest in a baccalaureate service.

"About 500 of the students said they would attend," he reported, "and then about 200 showed up."

"So when we started considering the matter this year, I talked to my neighbor, the Rev. Paul Thompson, who is minister of the first Baptist Church of Plymouth."

"He suggested we invite the pastors of the various churches to discuss the matter, and that's what we did."

OUT OF A SESSION that involved students, administration and clergy came the decision to drop the school service, suggest honoring graduates in their home churches June 9 and urge elected officials of Plymouth-Salem Township and Canton Township to proclaim that Sunday one dedicated to all graduates.

Bill Brown, principal of Plymouth-Salem High, said the administration concurred in the student decision.

"The number of students attending baccalaureate has decreased each year," he said, and added:

"Over the years I've been in school administration there has been a steady trend to get the baccalaureate out of the schools and let it go back into the churches where the kids who are involved as members of congregations can have a more meaningful experience."

MARKS AND ZIEL mentioned that in their time in school there had been increasing legal restrictions on prayer of any sort in school. They added that they felt the number of students actively involved in churches is less than formerly.

"There may be some people in the community who will be opposed to our dropping baccalaureate," Marks said, "but there will be very few seniors who will object. It's the decision of the class, and that's how it should be."

Located six miles apart on the shores of Lake Huron near Port Sanilac, the camps will be open for four two-week periods this summer, beginning June 29.

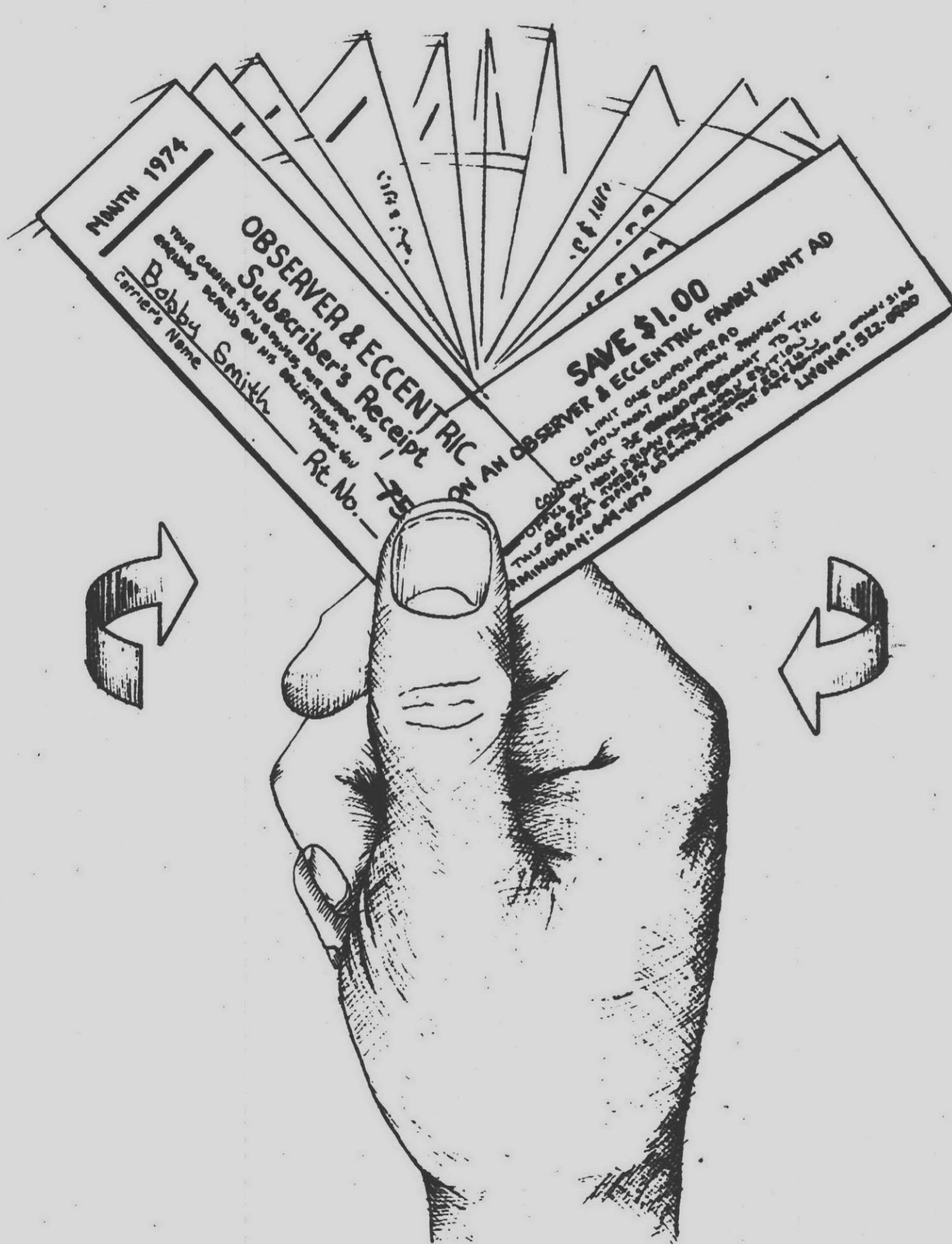
The camper fee is \$105 for 14 days for regular campers and \$110 for pioneers. Round trip transportation by chartered bus is \$5.

# State's No. 2 Churchill tops Canton, 4-1

Roger Frayer's Churchill Chargers - No. 1 in the area rankings and No. 2 in the state baseball polls just keep moving them down.

For the first time in Charger history, they are assured of a Western Six baseball crown. A 10 inning, 4-1 triumph over the one club that has beaten them this season, Plymouth Canton assured Churchill of at least a tie for the title.

Borgess got that run back in the fourth. With two out, Rich Davis singled, stole second and scored on a hit by Jim Pearce.

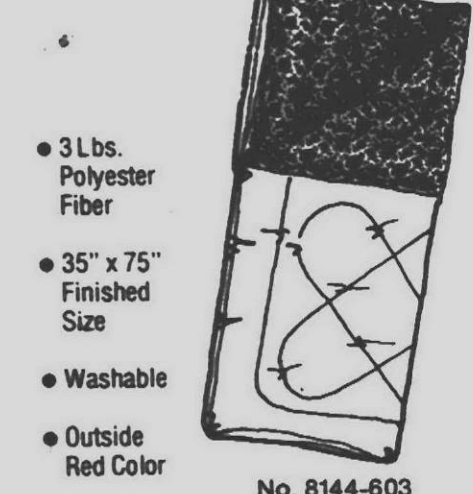

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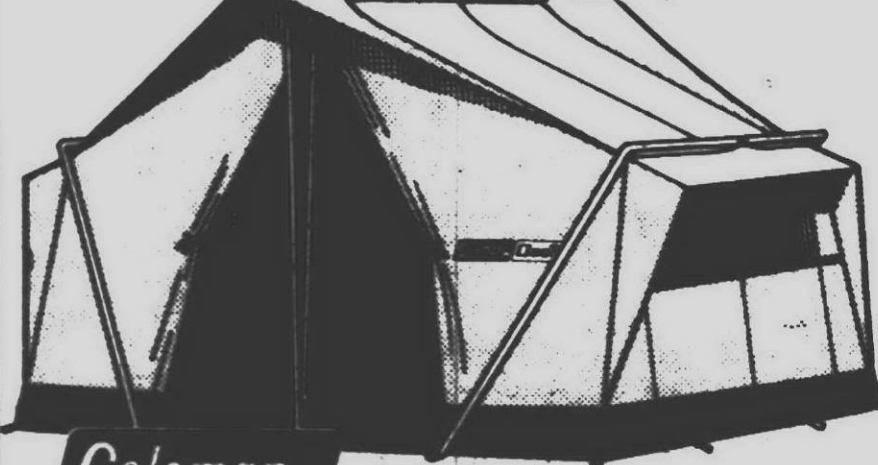


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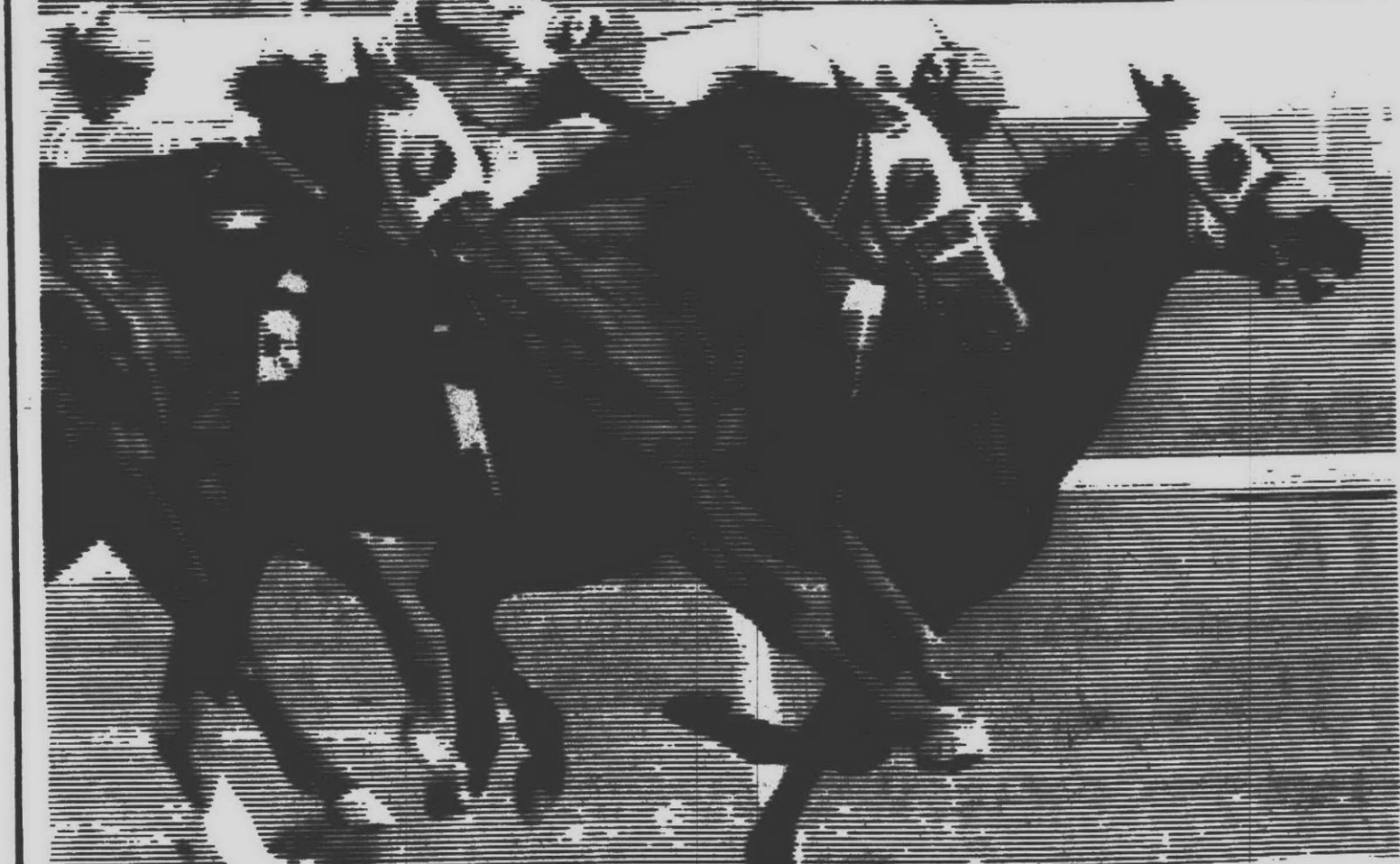
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**The Stroller**  
On suicides

Years ago, when The Stroller was taking his first steps on the long trail along the river of printers' ink, his respected old editor took him aside one afternoon and warned:

"Remember, things aren't always what they seem."  
This advice came to mind recently while listening to Dr. Bruce Danto speak on a rarely discussed subject — suicide — at our favorite service club.

Ordinarily, a discussion of suicide wouldn't hold much interest. But Dr. Danto is head of the Wayne County Suicide Prevention Center and knows whereof he speaks. More than that, he has the knack of making it interesting — with a laugh or two along the way.

It was in one of these moments when he lifted his listeners right out of their chairs — The Stroller among them — when he said that in many instances of what the law enforcement agents call murder is really suicide.

"Things aren't always what they seem," he said.

Shades of the old editor. The Stroller could almost see him again sounding the original warning.

"In many cases," Dr. Danto said, "the 'murdered' man was a coward who was afraid to take his own life. So, what did he do? He fired at another person, with no intention of hitting him, knowing that he would be killed in the return fire."

None of us ever had given that a thought.

"Even accidental gunshot deaths are questionable," he said, "and it can be argued whether fatalities from alcoholism or other substance abuse, isn't really a death wish on the part of the individual involved."

As a case in point, the good doctor asked whether the man, knowing he had a long night drive ahead, didn't purposely imbibe too freely on the theory that he would lose his life in a highway accident.

"It's worth thinking about," he emphasized.

Because of these theories Dr. Danto told us he didn't agree with statistics that show 25,000 deaths a year listed as suicides.

In Wayne County alone, he revealed, there are at least 1,000 annually and not the 300-400 reported.

And where do you think many of these suicides occur?

According to the latest statistics furnished by the good doctor, professional people have the highest rate with dentists leading the way.

These professionals who spend most of their time looking down in the mouth have three times the normal rate — and a fellow has to wonder why.

Another surprising nugget of information dropped by the doctor is the fact that American Indians have the highest rate and the youngest case ever reported was a four-year-old.

The Stroller also learned that prisons are the scene of many suicides and this is due, mainly, to the desperation of inmates and failure of the prison system to rehabilitate.

Among other things pointed out in the discussion is that there is discrimination against those who commit suicides.

As an example some cemeteries won't bury the person, some ministers refuse to hold services for them and in many other cases there is a loss of life insurance and death benefits.

In spite of all this The Stroller learned, to his amazement, that suicide has been on the increase since 1958.

To offset this rise there now is a suicide prevention center in Wayne County that makes great use of volun-

teers reaching out to individuals, through small groups and research, and setting up model projects to try to save these unfortunates from themselves.

The strangest thing, to The Stroller was that a discussion of such a rare subject as suicide could be so interesting and the words of the old editor came back with the explanation murders aren't always what they seem.

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## It's just like being Superman

One of man's greatest dreams is the desire to soar like a bird.

There has been the invention of the airplane to enhance this dream, but the real sensation of flying, the touch of the body to the wind, is not there.

This dream is much nearer coming true.

Hand gliding or sky-surfing, as it is referred to by dedicated air buffs, has been born in the form of the "Rogallo Wing" and the dream is here to be tested.

And for this "George Plimpton" of a sports editor, that test is the making of this story.

Sky Sails, an outlet for hand gliding people, sprang up in Royal Oak on Woodward and 10 Mile. This is the solo store of its sort in the Michigan area, and the man behind the No. 1 sail, Bob Newcomb, accepted the challenge of getting a sports editor off the ground in a brief dare at the winds of Mother Nature.

DURING THE drive to the Pontiac Lake State Recreation Area where Newcomb teaches his classes, I attempted to learn of this new sport.

I learned that this Rogallo Wing would be my key to becoming airborne; and that its was a sail spread over a few metal poles; and that once it's attached to your body, all you had to do was start running downhill, push off and it was up, up and away.

I also learned a little about the man who is confident this new venture will go over as well in this area as it has on the west coast.

The 25-year-old Newcomb has been into sail-flying for about a year.

"Why do I believe in this and how do I feel toward flying? Well, I guess first of all there is the adventure of clicking into the sail and off you go," said Newcomb.

"No two flights are ever the same. I guess I do it for both recreation and sport. I really don't believe it is as daring as a lot of people are making it out to be."

THE ENTIRE outfit weighs about 35 pounds with the nose and frame set at an 80 degree angle and the sail at 86 degrees. The problems start mounting when the angles are off with the weight increasing.

A complete sail-flying outfit costs about \$500.

The main reason Newcomb believes sail-flying can catch on in Michigan is that the entire coast of Lake Michigan is ideal for sailing.

"All sports-minded people will want to give this thing a shot," he added. "And this is a year round

sport. Heck, I was flying up at the Warren Dunes in my snowmobile suit in a 40 mph wind in 20 degree below zero temperatures.

"This has to appeal to anyone who ever tried to jump off a garage with an umbrella. And heck, let's face it, for that brief moment you are in the air, you really are Superman."

"I have been giving classes out here in Pontiac every Saturday and Sunday. I start everyone with two sessions of ground classes where we go over flight theory and pre-flight training.

"The entire class is eight hours total, and by this time every student is aware of what he or she can or can't do. And every flight is this sport is a solo.

"Those few seconds in the air can seem like hours."

WELL, THE HOUR finally came. We arrived at the hills that were waiting to be jumped off, and we quickly went over how the sail must be properly tuned before flight.

"The center tube has to banana up. If the tension is so where it bananas down, your flight will be just that — down."

I was quickly informed that you are not allowed a lot of mistakes in this sport and that the world record to date for continuous time in the air was something like 18 hours.

We found that "right hill" where a dash down into the wind which was then blowing at 15 mph would do the job.

"You always have to jump into the wind, get that neutral attitude and gradually push into it and apply tension."

"I always use the McDonald's 'wind-socks' for my wind gauge," said Bob. "I usually don't like to fly in winds above 25 mph and it's funny about wind. There are an average of about three days a year where there is no wind at all.

"You have to always be aware of what the wind is doing. You find yourself looking at trees, flags, grass, just about anything that can be influenced by the wind.

NOW CAME THAT moment of truth. After a few trial runs down the hill with the sail to get the feel of its reaction to the wind, it was time to put helmet on and snap in.

The first couple of runs down the hill were just that — runs. I was lacking in foot power as the speed of the legs and the mind were not working as one. The sail and the mind wound up fighting one another with a certain outcome — panic.

The third flight attempt made it all worth while. The leg speed was there, the tension was there, and the pushoff was gradual to meet the speed of the wind.

I couldn't believe it. I was actually flying. It seemed like I was up in the air for hours, but it turned out to be actually about 13 seconds.

I tabbed it a wierd feeling. Your controls are your arms on the suspension lever, and the rest is up to the wind. But it was really a unique moment of truth of man versus wind.

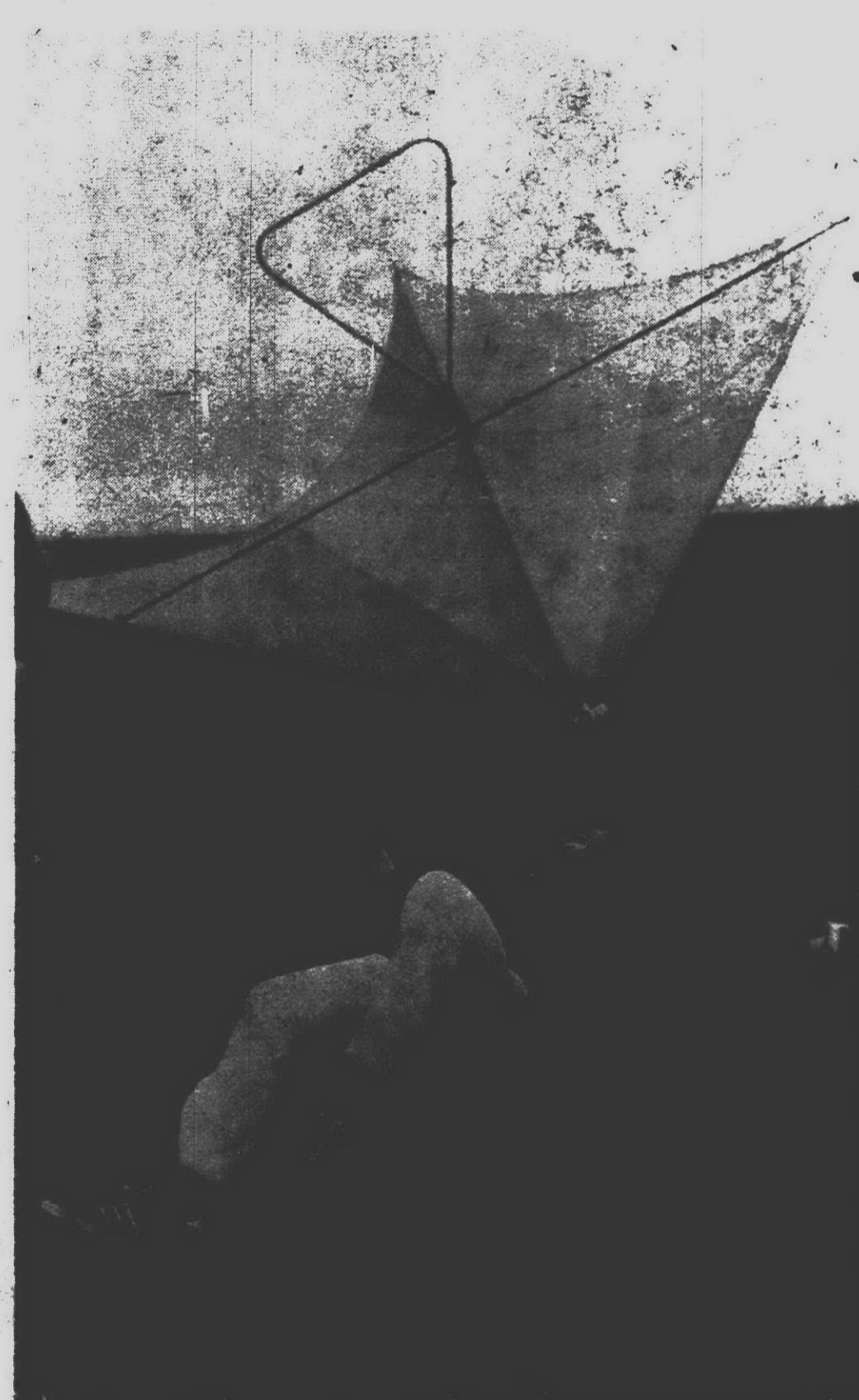
The landing was a gradual dip, and that first successful flight was a real feeling of accomplishment. Then, of course, feeling that I had already mastered this venture in a few minutes. It was back to the top of the hill. But this time the wind got the better of me.

After another good takeoff, everything went wrong. The arms and hands were in the wrong place. I pushed off too fast and I got the nose of the sail too high too fast. Down and over I went in a simple case of man hitting ground with thud.

And what if I did wind up with a broken finger, especially on my pitching hand? Eat your heart out, Superman.

The pacers and trotters are continuing on their merry way at Hazel Park's most successful meeting in history and incidentally the most lucrative in Michigan annals with another million dollar night recorded last Saturday and the second sub-2:00 mile of the year.

Miles under 2:00 have been few and far between thus far at the east side track, principally because of the rainy weather which for some unknown reason has managed to strike during the closing days of the week ... the programs when the better horses perform.

Shady Mile, one of the stars of the Dwayne Pletcher stable of Chicago and Indiana which is being handled by brother Del Pletcher at Hazel Park, blazed home in a quick :29.3 final quarter and hit the wire in 1:59.3.

THE SHADOW WAVE pacer was a length back as the field turned into the stretch and the amazing last quarter blast sent it past the leading Creeper Limbo, owned by a Southfield syndicate, and Shiaway Lad for an easy victory.

Meanwhile, five-year-old Huff 'N' Puff, charged from third in the last quarter for an upset victory in the \$11,000 invitational pace, winning in 2:00.1.

It was the fourth victory of the year for the mare and boosted her season earnings to \$25,601.

Blu Fireball, the even money favorite which had won four of its last five starts, was in front at the halfway point and going into the stretch but couldn't match the closing speed of the victor.

HUFF 'N' PUFF finished a length in front of Adios Rick with Bench, Mark third in a tight photo with the fading Blue Fireball.

Business was exceptionally good with the crowd of 12,269 wagering \$1,081,526. It was the 10th time Hazel Park had topped the million dollar mark.

The average nightly mutuel handle continued to climb towards the magic \$800,000 mark. After 50 nights of the 82-night meeting, wagering is averaging \$787,677 for an increase of \$6,000 per night over last week.

Hazel Park already has shattered all betting marks for a harness track in Michigan and if it continues at its present volume of business, it could become the first area racing track to outdo the thoroughbreds when competing head-and-head.

BUSINESS HAS PICKED up at the Detroit Race Course since returning to the late afternoon post but it is questionable whether the big mile plant will be able to overcome the slim pickings of early in the year.

However, with the vacation season less than a week away and plans already under way for what could be one of the best fields ever for the Michigan Mile, interest may pick up in the remaining weeks of the meeting.

Vice President and General Manager Dick Wilson, who isn't one to admit defeat very quickly, points to the increased handle during the week and the rainy Saturdays.

"On one side we're doing very well with the daily handle showing a gradual rise," he said, "but there isn't any way to beat those Saturdays when it starts to cloud up about time most folks would be leaving for the track and then begins to rain when they are halfway here. That poses a problem,

should they go on or go home and we're afraid many have chosen the latter.

"But that's part of the business, you have to take the good weather with the bad. The only thing I wish is that the rains would come on Tuesdays and Thursdays (the poorest days of the week traditionally at most tracks) and give the sun a chance to shine on Fridays and Saturdays."

Meantime, those close to the harness racing scene are wondering what Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley

plans to do now in the investigation of the much discussed charges of alleged fixing of races during the Jackson - at - Northville meeting in December of 1972.

THE INVESTIGATIONS began the following February when word spread like wildfire through the barn area that members of the commissioner's staff were questioning numerous drivers about their roles in the alleged fixing to big perfecta and perfecta races.

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
