townships wrestle with recurring problem

Plymouth and Canton townships have joined in a battle to insure they have police protection.

Plymouth Township has launched a two - pronged attack by joining other townships in a suit against Wayne County, which has threatened to end the sheriff's road patrol, and by eyeing a November ballot referendum on a course of action.

The Plymouth Township board voted Tuesday night to look into including an as - yet - undefined referendum on the general election ballot to provide police protection there.

The move came at the request of the Plymouth Township Community Improvement Association which suggested a multiple - choice type referendum giving alternatives.

But the township board voted to confer with its citizens' study committee on law enforcement to determine one recommendation for a ballot question. That committee, which issued its report a month ago, stressed the township starting its own police department as the best answer to the ques-

On a special election advisory question last fall, Plymouth Township voters narrowly said they were satisfied with current levels of police protection which is supplied primarily by the sheriff's road patrol and supported by the Michigan State Police Plymouth sub-post.

The county has threatened for the last three years to discontinue its road patrol protection for townships and the bell is about to sound in another round of that battle.

Plymouth and Canton townships have joined with five other townships in deciding to seek a court ruling on the extent of Wayne County's legal obligation to provide sheriff's patrols.

Banding with Plymouth and Canton in the proposed suit are Northville, Van Buren, Brownstown, Sumpter and Huron townships. The Wayne County Supervisors Association has agreed to

fund legal costs. Thus far, the county board of commissioners has backed down each year from its threatened cut off of the sheriff's road patrol. The latest extension is due to expire Aug. 1 and the county has indicated townships should begin or expand local police depart-

Plymouth Township has received two proposals for providing police protection, but both would cost more funds whereas county service currently comes from county taxes.

The city of Plymouth has suggested expanding its police protection to cover the township as well. A Plymouth Township police study committee has recommended the township set up its own police force.

Canton Supervisor Phil Dingeldey said a local study showed a Canton police force could "get started" for about \$200,000.

"We've been looking for the last year and a half, but we never jumped," he said. "We didn't feel there was any reason to."

"We feel we have quite a lot of help from the Michigan State Police,' Dingeldey said. "The posts at Plymouth and Ypsilanti take care of Michigan Avenue and Ford Road and the other main roads. Dingeldey, like the other local officials, feels township residents already per their share of sheriff road patrol costs through county taxes.

"A lot of the money comes from township taxes, and as more people move in the taxes go up," he said. "The tax rate has increased terrifically. Assessed valuation has doubled in the past three years and that's

The Plymouth Township police study committee estimated cost of establishing a local police force at more than \$200,000 in the first year alone. The figure would be equal to about 1.2 mills at the township's current state equalized valuation.

The missing water mystery

PLYMOUTH - If you happen to find 300 million gallons of water sloshing around somewhere in the city or township of Plymouth, please call Ken Vogras or Web Kincade immediately.

That is the combined amount of. water flowing through city and township mains which is unaccounted for annually . .

Where does it go? There are a lot of places, Kincade and Vogras say, that are known but still can't be accounted

But Kincade, the newly appointed DPW head in the township, stumbled across one 8,798,000 gallon discrepancy in a rather unusual place, at Plymouth City Hall.

It seems that for the past 18 months both the Hillside Inn and the Burroughs Credit Union have been on the township water system but the city kept billing them as though it were supplying the water as it had done in the past.

The error occurred in both the city and township billing offices when those two water customers were switched over from city to township water in September of 1972. Neither billing office took note of the change-

Things get even a little more sticky when you realize that the city has a higher water rate than the township. That problem was resolved when the city sent a check to the township for the amount it inadvertantly collected for township water and checks to both the Hillside and Burroughs Credit Union returning the difference in the water rates.

Where are the other places water is unaccounted for?

In a list compiled for the city by Vogras in 1971 — when water loss in the city was unusually large and a

topic of city hall concern — the city DPW director said leaks, fire hydrant use, sewer cleaning and flushing, street cleaning, malfunctioning water meters, drinking fountains running continuously, vandals turning fire hydrants on, contractors using hydrants without permits, underestimated flat rate water customers and water use at the DPW yards represented the unaccounted amount of water lost

Vogras said that a watermain hole the size of the period at the end of this sentence can lose 170 gallons of water every 24 hours at 40 pounds pressure. Water loss in larger holes increases geometrically.

Last year the city had about 13 per. cent of its water unaccounted for while the township loss - now that the Hillside Inn and Burroughs Credit Union discrepencies have been corrected - amounted to about 15 per



Vogras has also taken steps, since the issue arose in 1971, to track down where the city's water goes.

The problem is compounded because the city and the township pay for sewage disposal to the county based on the number gallons of water they buy from the Detroit Metropolitan Water Board.

Neither of the DPW directors think they can track down every drop, but the water at the Hillside comes.

The Wayne 2nd District Democratic organization honored one of its veteran workers, Sidney Diamond, at a spring congressional dinner held Saturday night in the Waterman Center at Schoolcraft College.

The special honors came as a surprise to Diamond, who has been active in many behind-the-scenes roles with the Livonia Democratic campaigns, as a precinct and convention delegate and party worker.

He is founding chairman of Livonia Interested Democrats, a splinter group that has differed with the regular district organization from time to time on candidates and issues.

Seven of Wayne County's circuit judges make their homes in Livonia, Plymouth or Redford and they are happy as larks in their nests.

Judges Victor J. Baum, Harry J. Dingeman and Richard M. Maher head for Livonia when they leave their offices at the end of the day.

Judges George E. Bowles and Thomas J. Foley make for Plymouth and Judges James N. Canham and James L. Ryan for Redford. Several are longtime residents.

JUDGE FOLEY has lived in the same house in Plymouth Township just outside the city for 20 years.

Judge Bowles lived in Plymouth from 1947 to 1960, then moved back

Judge Canham has been a Redford resident for 21 years.

"I was just beginning law practice and had an apartment dweller as a bride." Judge Canham said, so they moved into an apartment near Five Mile and Beech Daly.

"I had just been admitted to the bar and was such an astute young lawyer that I didn't even know I was leaving Detroit," he laughed in remembrance.

Later, with a baby, the Foleys moved "just one mile down the road" to a subdivision attractive to young married couples and have lived there ever since. "It's a great community," said the judge whose family now counts five children "some in college, some in high school and some in ele-

mentary." "At one time we had one in kindergarten and one in college at the same time."

Judge Foley explained his attachment to Plymouth Township by describing it as a "beautiful community, a friendly type of community." His son, who is ending his second year in college, "knows no other home," Foley said.

Pickwickians gain support in fight with Moceri

CANTON - "I don't think they (Moceri builders) should be allowed to do anything anywhere until this situation is corrected."

That statement from Canton Township Supervisor Philip Dingeldey came after the township board heard complaints from angry homeowners in the Pickwick Village subdivision, a Moceri project east of Lilley Road between Warren and Ford roads.

The homeowners told the board residential horror stories of falling roofs, boardwalks where porches are supposed to be, basements full of water, no sidewalks or driveways and "half -

completed homes." Pickwick Homeowners Civic Association spokesman James Mundo, who has owned a Moceri home since February, described the situation as "unbelievable.'

"Instead of a subdivision," he said, "we have mud, dirt, traffic and trash. Our children play in the streets because Moceri won't do the grading and concrete work."

Dingeldey and other members of the board responded that they did indeed believe the homeowners and that reports from the township's building inspectors concurred with the complaints of the residents.

"We know how bad it is," Dingeldey said, "and there's no excuse for it. If we stop him (Moceri) from doing everything else, maybe he'll finish up...I don't think he should be allowed to build another home until he corrects this."

Mundo told the board that the homeowners had come for help in making Moceri "live up to his promises...to just abide by common decency.

"We've talked to Moceri," he said, "and his answer is always 'next week'...we have tremendous problems but all he will say is 'we will do it to-

morrow.' We've been through months and months of that.

"Summing up their attitude," Mundo said, "when we were about to move in, with our kids, and the house a mess and with no stove, I asked the man (a superintendent who has since been replaced) to help us. He asked, 'Is it all closed (the home purchase) When I said it was, he said, 'tough -'-I threatened to beat him up."

Mundo said that the homeowners, who now number "60 to 80," had begun to mount an attack on Moceri to force his cooperation.

He noted that they had erected signs on their property warning prospective buyers to avoid the Moceribuilders, and that they had shut down showing of the subdivision models by

picketing. "We are concerned about the effect this thing could have on the township," he said. "This could be a great community - we would hate to see it spoiled by somebody like this who will make people afraid to move out here for fear of getting into a situation like

The board noted that it would take steps to stop Moceri's building if he would not comply with his promises, but members were urged by homeowners not to take the builder's promises seriously.

The board assured them that they would not. "What he says is irrelevant," said one trustee. "What he does and has not done is what is important."

Dingeldey thanked the Pickwick homeowners for their presentation and promised action on their prob-

"Give us a week and we'll see what we can do," he said. "We've got enough of a tool to stop him from building in that subdivision, and we're not going to listen to him, we're going to listen to you"

Urges low-income housing

'Egg head' lobbies for society's underdogs

At age 38, Joe Guggenheim has a background that reads like the biography of an "egg head."

But he's a modest, down-to-earth guy with a beard and an unmistakable New York accent, shuffling through papers on a messy desk, sipping coffee and talking about his job.

Guggenheim is a full-time staff of one. He's executive director of the Michigan Committee on Law and Housing (MCLH) and you can't separate the man from the job.

MCLH is a private association with an office in Southfield. It is funded by 125 dues paying members, 30 affiliated organizations, religious groups and some New Detroit support.

Officially, MCLH is described as a

Guggenheim, a labor economist, graduated magna cum laude from the City College of New York, was a Phi Beta Kappa and the recipient of two scholastic awards. He earned his master's degree in labor relations at Cornell University.

Before coming to Detroit in 1962, he was a research analyst in industrial and labor relations, a laboratory instructor in statistics and a research assistant at the National Bureau of Economic Research in New York.

He was director of housing and housing task force leader for New Detroit and worked for eight years as a housing specialist and research economist for the United Auto Work-

"Before the 1967 Detroit riots,"

the MCLH," Guggenheim said. "New Detroit was formed and initiated proposals for tenants rights and code en-

"In 1968, our group established district councils for citizen participation in all urban renewal areas in Michigan and strengthened relocation requirements. An act was passed which istration's termination of housing and

appropriated \$1 million for seed money for low and moderate income housing development."

MCLH members are concerned about the "bulldozer" approach to industrial and institutional redevelopment which fails to provide housing for the poor.

"We've been working on a home purchase protection act to save potential home buyers from being ripped off by unscrupulous speculators," Guggenheim said. "We've been lobbying for enactment in Lansing.

"We're trying to obtain state funding to rehabilitate older neighborhoods. We act as a watchdog on State Housing Development Authority operations, and are pushing for land use laws so people can live wherever they want to live."

Guggenheim maintains the state works on "middle class" problems. Last year, the MCLH initiated a Michigan emergency committee against the housing cut-off, a coalition endorsed by 115 organizations. The committee fought against the admin-

Guggenheim, an active Democrat, is a member of the American Civil Liberties Union and lives in the Lafayette Towers in Detroit.

Shuffling through another stack of papers on his desk, Guggenheim said; "We can sure use more volunteers to do clerical work and answer the phone. And we encourage new members. We've got a lot of important work ahead of us."

"OUR GOAL," said Guggenheim, "is that urban needs be better expressed. The purpose of state land use legislation is to end fragmentation and conflict that prevents wise use of

our limited lands resources. "Legislation is needed to assist in the decision making on development with an area or state wide perspective, rather than just a local

viewpoint. "The state should have a voice in decisions to protect unique natural areas, control urban sprawl, stimulate urban development and prevent arbitrary zoning that totally excludes lower income housing in many commu-

nities." Guggenheim admits the amended bill isn't the optimum, but is substantial. Some concerned individuals have advised that even a watered-down bill is better than none at all and would be a foot in the door.

"I'm not prepared to sell out," Guggenheim insisted. "Maybe there will be a more liberal Democratic shift in the house after the next election."







Methadone use advised, but with tighter control

mended that the synthetic narcotic. methadone, continue to be used to treat heroin addicts in Wayne County but under tighter controls than at

The committee's tentative recommendations were aired May 29 in the City - County Building auditorium.

The study committee was established by the county board of commissioners in January at the request of seven commissioners who reported growing concern about the abuse of methadone.

The study committee was appointed by Commissioner Paul Silver (D -Detroit), who was chairman of the human resources committee at the time and a sponsor of the resolution calling for the study. Other sponsors of the resolution included commissioners Tom F. Taylor (D - Westland), whose district includes Garden City, and Mary E. Dumas (R - Livonia).

DR. KENNETH SCHOOFF, director of drug treatment programs at Lafayette Clinic, is chairman of the study committee.

While recommending methadone programs be continued "at least at the current level," the committee declared the goal should be "zero dosage" or a narcotics free state for all

Two recommendations are likely to draw objections from operators of programs which dispense methadone,

An expert committee has recom- says Dr. Edward Leibson, director of the Wayne County Department of Substance Abuse Services. Leibson was staff liaison for the study.

One is that daily doses of methadone not exceed 50 milligrams (mg.) except in unusual circumstances where doses of not more than 100 mg. might be needed for a short time.

Presently, Leibson says, doses vary from clinic to clinic within the 120 mg. limit set by the Federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Fifty mg. has been found sufficient to relieve withdrawal symptoms, he added, and poses less risk of death if the patient suddenly is deprived of

The other recommendation Leibson expects to be controversial involves the ratio of clinic staffs to patients. The study recommends a minimum ratio of four counselors, two nurses and 50 per cent of a physician's time for each 150 patients.

It also recommends that clinics serve between 75 and 150 clients, and that larger amounts be divided into independent groups within that size

Those ratios are greatly exceeded at many clinics, says Leibson.

FOLLOWING THE public hearing, final recommendations will be prepared for consideration by the human resources committee of the board.

If adopted by the board, the requirements will apply to 25 programs which have contracts with Leibson's office and will affect up to 4,000 addicts being maintained on methadone in the programs.

SPECIFIC CRITERIA should be adopted to govern client eligibility, program goals, methadone dosage, therapeutic programs, urine tests, program organization and medical

Diversion of methadone for illegal use has diminished since the FDA adopted new control guidelines last year, and the "vast majority" of Wayne County programs apparently adhere to the FDA regulations.

Efforts to establish methadone treatment centers in industrial plants should be continued, the study advised, although success has been "quite limited" because of worker reluctance to sign up for treatment.

Safety car is being designed

There have been rumors in the automobile trade that General Vehicle. Inc., whose new facility is located in Livonia, did not really have a new super - safe car.

"We've been considered by some a company with a non - existent product - it's been implied that we didn't actually have a car." said GV Manufacturing Vice - President Richard Vollmer.

Then he took a ballpeen hammer and beat a fender of the allegedly non - existent Bricklin Safety Car hard enough to neduce a normal car body to scrap metal. He didn't make a dent.

The new vehicle exists alright. There are a couple of prototypes currently in the Livonia building at 37000 Plymouth Road, reportedly one in Philadelphia and still others in Phoenix, where the company is based.





Must doctors t. ll parents about users?

Q. I've been to two different doctors for help. I've been on speed for three years, but none of them would handle my case without my parents' knowledge. How come? I was told by someone who should know that I could be treated by a doctor without my parents finding out.

L.L., Westland

A. What the law says is that if you as a minor so request, a physician may treat you for a drug problem and not advise your parents. What the law does NOT say is that any physician must accept you on this basis as a patient. There are several reasons why a physician may choose not to accept such a case:

1. It may be his professional judgement that treating you without parental knowledge may not be in your best interest although you feel that it is.

2. There's the very practical matter of whether you are financially able to pay for what may be a fairly long course of therapy.

If you are experiencing physical symptoms or discomfort of any kind, it's best not to diagnose your own problem. If you wish, stop in at our free medical clinic Tuesdays from 8 to 10p.m. at the Westland AIDE Crisis Center, 8068 N. Wayne Road.

Voters will be electing more Juvenile Court jurists

Wayne County voters will add two judges to the juvenile court bench in this year's elections.

The county board of commissioners recently voted to place two additional probate judgeships on the Aug. 6 primary ballot, with the expressed understanding they would be assigned to juvenile court, a division of probate court

The board acted the day after a bill was signed into state law — giving the county authority to increase the probate court bench by as many as four seats. A special board meeting was called May 23 because candidates face a June 18 deadline for filing nominating petitions.

commissioners decided to add only two seats after being told by Presiding Probate Court Judge Willis Ward that the court's docket is current and only juvenile court needs more help.

The main probate court bench has six judges. Juvenile court has one judge, James H. Lincoln, and seven lawyer - referees.

Lincoln told commissioners additional judges are needed rather than the referees because U.S. Supreme Court - imposed procedures must be handled by judges.

Smit's bill would relieve tax delays

State Rep. Raymond J. Smit (R - Ann Arbor) has introduced a bill in the Michigan House aimed at relieving local governments with problems he feels are caused by "inefficiency and foot - dragging" by the state tax commission

House Bill 6082 introduced by Smit, whose 52nd District includes Plymouth and Plymouth Township, gives each county board of commissioners the right to declare a tentative tax roll as the final levy.

If passed, HB 6082 gives the county board two options when equalization appeals result in the increased tax—spread the additional levy on the next annual tax roll or declare the tentative roll to be the final levy.

"The problem isn't so much one of increased taxation," explains Smit, "Rather it is one of administrative feasibility. How do you treat a property that has been subdivided since the original levy? Who do you charge the tax to when the owner at the time of the original levy has moved away? Can you enforce collection of the tax

against the subsequent owner?
"Local governments shouldn't be presented with those problems when the problem is solely the result of inefficiency and foot - dragging by the state tax commission.

"This bill would solve the problem of the STC delay," Smit concludes, "Hopefully the tax tribunal will be more efficient in the handling of appeals so that the problems being experienced now in Washtenaw County won't be repeated."

County asked to spend \$25,000

Wayne County Board of Commissioners is considering spending at least \$25,000 to build a 20 - mile bikeway this summer at Newburgh Road in Livonia.

The public works committee has asked the board to spend \$25,000 for the bike path, and perhaps \$25,000 more to build the path from Dearborn to Northville. The path would run through the Middle Rouge Park and Edward Hines Park.

The state will spend \$50,000 and the Wayne County Road Commission \$25,000 if the board of commissioners agrees to spend \$25,000. The public works committee has recommended a contribution of \$50,000 if the road commission also hikes its contribution by \$25,000.

The initial funding will help complete the first stage of paths, which will run about three miles.

In recent years, the Supreme Court has extended to juveniles many rights of adults, including the rights to court - appointed counsel and jury trials. "Instead of pleading their clients guilty, the attorneys are asking for trials, trials, trials," Lincoln told commissioners.

Judge Ward said it may be necessary to expand the probate court bench in the future because the Supreme Court is expected to impose new requirements for commitment hearings for mental cases.

could affect mentally ill and retarded

"Jane Doe vs. Michigan Department of Mental Health" is a lawsuit asking the Wayne Circuit Court to require a probate court hearing before a child may be committed to a state institution for treatment.

Also sought is a writ of habeas corpus ordering that all children "being held" in state institutions without

their consent or with a court commitment order be released. At present, parents may have their child committed for treatment.

A COLOR OF THE SECOND OF THE PROPERTY OF THE P

The suit also asks the court to prohibit "medical experimentation," including routine tests, on children in state institutions and to require public access to records of experiments or research involving the children.

The Michigan Association for Emotionally Disturbed Children already has been granted leave by the court to intervene in opposition to the plaintiffs' demands.

County Commissioner Paul Silver (D - Detroit), who proposed that the board oppose the plaintiffs in court, said object of the suit is to place parents in the position of being adversaries of their children.

"Poor parents should be able to have their children admitted to a state institution for the same tests which affluent parents can have done by their own doctor," Silver says.

John J. McCann, an assistant county corporation counsel, told the board that some areas of the suit aren't likely to be disputed. "No one in this case feels there should be experimentation with the children, with no public knowledge of the experiments."

1990 plan revised to shift parks closer to urban areas

By TIM RICHARD

A compromise parks plan that emphasizes land closer to the urban population has won approval in a split vote of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments' executive com-

Losers in a pair of 6-3 votes were: ·Washtenaw County delegates, who sought a higher priority for the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority's planned Mill Creek park, located 52 miles from downtown Detroit.

Detroit Mayor Coleman Young. whose aide, William Cilluffo, demanded greater emphasis on regional parks and recreation spending within Detroit city limits.

SEMCOG'S EXECUTIVE committee met Friday in Northland Inn. Southfield. What it approved was the Council on Regional Development's proposed amendments to the "1990 Regional Recreation and Open Space Program.'

The open space program will serve as a guideline to state agencies and the federal government's Bureau of Outdoor Recreation, both for their own planning and for distribution of federal and state aid.

The SEMCOG plan reflects a staff proposal for an "inner ring" of regional parks facilities located closer to the urbanized area than (for example) HCMA's Kensington and Stony Creek metroparks.

Staff man Dan Snyder explained that more weight (70 per cent) was given to "system utility" and the distance of a site from population centers than to "resource utility" (30 per

WASHTENAW COUNTY delegate Thomas Fegan sought unsuccessfully to raise the II and III ratings given to the Mill Creek plan to I and II rat-

A rating of I would aim at park site purchase by 1980, a II by 1985 and a III by 1990.

Oak Park Mayor David Shepherd, who chairs the Council on Regional Development, said "the Mill Creek plan should be held in abeyance until a water quality study is completed." The Mill Creek plan calls for a dam that would flood hundreds of acres of farmland. (In contrast, the Kent Lake dam flooded what was mostly swamp-

When HCMA Director David Laidlaw questioned the absence of the proposed Novi-Wixom park, SEMCOG staffer Snyder said Novi officials were critical both of the original site and a proposed alternative. The staff is seeking another alternative -- outside Novi, Snyder said.

CILLUFFO, SITTING in for Detroit's Mayor Young, objected that there was "nothing for Detroit" and voted against the final plan, as did Will Hardy, an aide to Wayne County Board Chairman Robert FitzPatrick.

To these criticisms, Laidlaw replied: "There's no possibility of a Wayne County . . . Distance is relative. Most people go up north (until the gasoline shortage). You can go and come back (to a Huron-Clinton park). on a half-tank of gas.

"There are three major parks in Wayne County - Lower Huron, Willow and Oakwoods. We're providing recreation FOR Detroit. It's just not IN Detroit."

W. L. (Larry) Mainland; former SEMCOG chairman, agreed and warned: "You better get your land while the getting is good." Thirty years ago, Mainland reminisced, his home area of Milford Township had 41 farms and 12 orchards; today it has only 12 farms and one orchard.

Replacement sought for SEMTA board

Oakland County leaders are looking

Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority. David F. Breck, Birmingham attorney and former city commissioner, has declined to ask for reappointment to the six-county bus and rapid transit authority.

Breck's decision was announced at last week's executive committee meeting of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG), which appoints six of the SEMTA board's nine members for staggered terms. Gov. Milliken appoints three

Larry Pernick, Oakland County commissioner from Southfield and SEMCOG delegate, told SEMCOG chiefs the Oakland board is "considering many names, but we haven't pinned it down." Pernick expected an Oakland recommendation by the June 7 SEMCOG session.

Seeking reappointment to the SEM-TA board is Mrs. Manuel J. Myers of Detroit. She has no known opposition.

SEMCOG's executive committee raised its collective eyebrows when the SEMTA board submitted an \$8.7 million budget that was nearly \$500,000 in the red. SEMCOG's executive committee,

under state law, has the power of review and comment over the transportation agency's budget. The budget for fiscal 1975 was received without action or further comment.

A SEMTA staff member, Dan Morrill, said "contingency plans" for budget cuts would be put into effect if it turns out that revenue really is a half-million short, as projected.

One major reason for less revenue, he said, is a decline in state gasoline tax returns due to the gasoline shortage and less travel by the public during the last nine months.





The school elections, little more than a week away, are beginning to come to a boil.

With 16 candidates trying for four seats, one expects a certain amount of mad scrambling in the board races but sifting through so many candi-

Most of the interest lies with the race for the two four - year terms where a rematch between Joe "Landslide" Gray and Marcia Borowski is shaping up. Gray beat Borowski by 18 votes last time and her campaign committee is hard at work trying to find at least that many new votes this time.

George Lawton, an incumbent, is trying for reelection in the four - year race but may be surprised by the long memories of the anti - Moceri forces in his Canton Township. Lawton, when he was serving as Canton Township planning commission chairman, didn't endear himself to those folks.

The two newcomers in that race, John Hibler and Dean Mullison will be fighting three well - known names for a seat.

The one - year terms race looks like the field at the just past Kentucky Derby. EVERYBODY's running.

Only Tom Turner is an incumbent in that contest and he was appointed to the school board to fill John Graves' seat and thus has never stood before the voters.

Turner was appointed from 12 candidates who applied for appointment to the board last fall after Graves resigned, yet of the 12, only he and Borowski were interested enough to run for the board this year.

With so many - 11 - candidates running for the two short terms, it's hard to imagine what will happen where regional or special interest (such as the teachers' union) groups could vote as a bloc and push their candidate in.

Also on the ballot are three issues. A 6.5 mill of operating levy is up for renewal and most certainly will pass handily.

Recreation project offers help for mentally retarded

One of the field test centers for a recreation program to aid mentally retarded youngsters will be in the Livonia School District under the direction of Erika Gans

The program, developed at Michigan State University in cooperation with several school systems in the state, will provide the special and rection of Dr. Janet Wessel.

Called "I CAN," the program was formulated by members of the university's health, physical education and recreation departments under the dito develop curriculum programs for the trainable mentally impaired child (IQ ranging from 25 to 50) funded by the U.S. Office of Education.

IN THE PAST there has been no real recommended method of getting the mentally impaired child to perform any phsyical activity.

One of the important objectives is to develop the child's confidence in himself to play games on his own or with a team, act independently, gain self - respect, move effectively and neighborhood surroundings.

The I CAN stands for "Individualize instruction, Create social competence. Associate all learnings, and Narrow the gap between theory and practice.

The project gives the special education teacher the program material needed for children to learn in a group and progress at their own pace at the same time.

The four basic program divisions are aquatics, body management, fundamental skills, health and fitness. Aquatics involves learning to float, swim the crawl and some self - rescue skills.

Body management includes posture, body awareness and control and awareness of environment.

Fundamental skills takes in such things as running, leaping, jumping, throwing, slugging and rythmic skills such as dancing.

Under health and fitness, the emphasis will be on exercises for fitness along with proper diet and weight

THE SPECIAL education teacher man use any or all of the segments. Other aspects of the curriculum will be coordinated with the physical activity - art, music, math, science as well as the more obviously related areas of health and daily living will be brought into the child's physical awareness.

Each skill or exercise has been broken down into its most simple movements. If the child has no ability or very limited ability to communicate, a form of non - verbal communication

The project is one of four designed arm movements with running. One of our instructors took a punching bag attached to a pole and got the child to punch it, alternating with each fist. Then the instructor started to move away from the child getting him to strike the bag and walk at the same time. Gradually the walking pace was increased to a running pace with the child slugging away and finally the bag was taken away but the child kept moving his arms while running."

UNTIL NOW, the emphasis has been on primary skills. The MSU prohave a feeling of belonging in his own gram is being expanded to the development of more complicated or advanced skills such as dancing, neighborhood games, outdoor education and camping, fishing and boating.

"Don't kid yourself," says Dr. Wessel, "these kids can really play good basketball. They can do a lot of things very well.

'There's a world of occuupations or jobs in the leisure world which can be held by mentally impaired persons. With proper direction in career education these kids could learn to be able to take certain jobs in recreation

The I CAN project also includes a competency - based teacher preparation program which can be adapted to other situations.

County industrial guide is available

Wayne County Office for Industrial and Commercial Development has updated its booklet on industrial parks in the county.



Remmington, Mayflower VFW commander: Mary Holdsworth, president of the Mayflower VFW ladies auxiliary; Robert B. Finley, Passage - Gayde Post American Legion commander: Phyllis Kewer, president of the American Legion auxiliary: Cecil Fehrlin, commander of the Benton Parkway Barracks of World War I veterans; and Gladys M. Ryder, president of the Benton Barracks auxiliary.

Roger McGonagle of the American Legion post served as aide to the grand marshal of the parade.

Ernest Stratychuk of Dearborn, past commander of the Michigan VFW and current chairman of the VFW's National Americanism Committee, delivered the Memorial Day

He likened the United States in 1974 to Rome in the years of its decline, reminding the audience that it's up to the American people to maintain a government of integrity under which its citizens can live freely.

He quoted Cicero: "Don't blame Ceasar — he is but one man. Blame the people of Rome, they acquiesced in their loss of freedom.

"I was shocked," he continued, "to find that in 13 of the last 14 presidential elections in this country the man who was elected president of the United States received fewer votes than the number of eligible voters who failed to go to the polls.

"In my book it isn't the pot, the hash, the LSD or the heroin that rank as the most dangerous drugs we must contend with at this crucial time in our history - it's a 'drug' which I call 'SFN' - 'Something For Noth-

"This drug is eating away at the cardinal virtues of self - reliance and self - respect and is leading to the corrosion of the human spirit through subsidized idleness.

"Those who belittle the importance of the profit incentive are, in my opinion, leading the youth of America up a blind alley."

Stratychuk aimed some of his strongest remarks at an administration in Washington which he said has failed to provide us with spiritual leadership.

"Arthur Sylvester, while serving as assistant secretary of defense, was quoted as having said: 'It is the inherent right of government to lie to save itself.' I wonder if he was referring to saving itself from an enemy, or saving itself from the wrath of its own citizens

Stratychuk challenged the hundreds of Plymouth residents in attendance to actively reaffirm their beliefs in the American system.




Federation objects to city agenda cutback

No one is really sure what the future holds or what a nuclear holocaust would be like. Perhaps that's what makes films like "Chosen Survivors" sointriguing.

Although few science fiction films receive the praise of film critics, the public is invariably drawn to them. They give some insight as to what "might be" in the future, some more logically than others.

"Chosen Survivors" proves to be one of the more logical ones if you tend to be a bit skeptical of governmental operations.

The film takes place at the present time and civilization has supposedly been wiped out by a nuclear war, except for a few individuals chosen to survive because of their skills and what they can offer a future species. which they're supposed to found.

The government has constructed several installations 1,700 feet underground at various points across the country so that in event of a nuclear war, a few persons would be able to

survive in each one. The nuclear war supposedly happens and the film focuses on one of the installations where nine persons have been chosen to go, plus an army major in charge/of maintaining the installation who was there at the time

Among the survivors are the army

major, also an engineer (Richard Jaeckel), a corporate executive (Jackie Cooper), a novelist (Alex Cord), a congresswoman (Diana Muldaur), a behavorial scientist (Bradford Dillman), a biologist, an ecologist, an oceanographer, a nutritionist and an Olympic gold medal winner.

The installation is equipped with all the modern conveniences necessary for man's survival, even birds and fish to add a bit of nature. It has enough provisions to last the survivors for five years, at which time it is assumed the radiation level above ground will be safe enough for them

However, there is no way they can get out until the amount of radiation does reach a safe level. They are completely sealed off.

The survivors can, however, view what is happening above ground via satellite. The world they see has been transformed into a huge erupting mass of fire and flames and what looks like a volcanic eruption.

Before the initial shock has worn

off, the survivors are faced with en-

which are somehow finding their way into the sented off installation.

The army major explains that the installation was built in a cave which probably was inhabited by bats. Through a slight oversight by the government, the bats were sealed in the underground cave with the installation.

The survivors, besides learing to cope with one another and facing the fact that they have nothing left but themselves, must now find how the bats are getting in and try to prevent

Of course the bats won't attack while the lights are on, but something goes haywire in the electrical circuits and every so often the lights go out.

During a few of the scenes a strong stomach is required and in some cases a hand over the mouth will do.

Anyone with an open mind will keep wondering all through the movie could this really happen? And does it really happen, even in the movie?

There is some doubt among a few of the chosen survivors about why they're there and whether there ever really was a nuclear war. A plus for the movie is that you never really know until the end.

That hit-run killer still free

How long can a hit-run driver, who caused the death of a beautiful, young girl, live with the crime? How long can that motorist keep the details of the fatality within his or her body without it beginning to bother?

These are questions that arise at this particular time of the year as it is recalled that just three years ago this spring Chris Beattie, a member of the graduating class of Bentley High in Livonia, was run down by a hit-run driver, allowed to lay alongside the road and then died while en route to St. Mary Hospital in an ambulance.

And during those three years, the Livonia police department has never closed the case even though it is no closer to a solution today than it

NATURALLY THE department isn't as involved in investigations of the Beattie case as it

was three years ago, but just the same, every single member of the Accident Prevention Bureau would like to have it cleared up.

Never have they been able to come up with a witness of an accident that happened in late afternoon on a bright, sunny spring day. Never have they been able to come up with any answers, even though they traced out hundreds of tips.

But somewhere in the area is a driver who knows that Chris Beattie was run down and killed by his car. (It could have been a feminine driver, too.) Somewhere there are witnesses who could have given better identification of the car and driver so the police would have had something more to work with.

We have always hoped that the someone would eventually become conscience-stricken and make a complete confession to police. It hasn't happened, and that's what makes it so sad that in this day and age someone could have committed such a crime and still is free.

IT WON'T HELP the still grieving parents if a confession is made, but at least they will have the peace of mind of knowing who was respon-

We became interested in the Beattie case shortly after it happened because we couldn't believe a hit-run driver could race away and never

We always had faith in persons seeing an accident telling the truth and doing everything possible to aid the police in apprehending a killer. After three years, we still have that faith, but would you want to believe that gradually we are beginning to believe faith is one thing, truth another and reluctance to talk to police officers a

Memorial reflections on old farm houses

Memorial Day is a fine holiday.

July Fourth is jazzy, with parades and hot dog mustard on your pants, but the muggy weather saps the energy. Labor Day carries twinges of sadness, signaling as it does the end of summer lazy days and the start of the fall bustle.

Thanksgiving is warm and filled with all sorts of traditional associations, but the weather is always sloppy and cold. Christmas has gone commercial, and New Year too often disappears into the champagne glass well before midnight.

But Memorial Day is great. Michigan is at its best with the May weather. The lilacs are in bloom, and the trees have leafed out in a warm, friendly green. Summer is about to happen, you've made it through another winter, and you can sit back and relax for the whole weekend.

SOMEHOW, I associate lovely, old, white-painted farmhouses with Memorial Day, probably because it was the family tradition to drive out into the country to visit the grand-

The farmhouses seem even more beautiful now than they did then, possibly because so many have been torn down here/in the suburbs and replaced with ranch homes.

Farm houses have angles and proportion and a sense of style and individuality that much modern construction lacks, and usually they have a big tree or two and a purple lilac bush growing nearby, giving them the setting and the space that a typical subdivision lacks.

In suburban communities -- which by definition are new - they represent an important link with the past which is so lacking when you drive down miles of pavement to the new shopping cen-



What is needed is a program to take some of the federal and state money allocated to the Bicentennial Commission and channel it into a series of grants for local communities to purchase, restore and preserve the architectural heritage of our past. There are many millions of dollars appropriated for the bicentennial, but little of it - as things look now - will go into much of anything that will last us for another 200

In fact, it might make sense to set up a metropolitan-wide historical landmark and preservation authority, to act as a conduit for the money, evaluate the esthetics and importance of the buildings to be preserved, and make sure community groups involved adhere to some reasonable standards of taste and responsibility.

Then, on Memorial Days to come, we will still be able to see the old buildings, linking us with the past and refreshing the present.

Under the federal tax reform act of 1969, even the lowly mollusk shells are granted a percentage depletion allowance. The amount is five per cent. More than 100 minerals are covered by the act, with allowances ranging from five to 22 per cent.

The part of the act that gets the most attention is the oil depletion allowance. Many tax reformers have been working strongly to eliminate this so called loophole. But is it a loophole or is it, in fact, something beneficial to the country?

What is the rationale behind mineral or oil depletion allowances?

CONGRESS FACED the problem of how to draw up tax provisions that would effectively tax income without taxing capital.

In the case of ordinary assets such as machinery and equipment, this problem is solved by allowing regular deductions for depreciation until the cost of the income-earning piece of property is restored. The idea, of course, was to return the cost of the asset tax free over its life so it could

be replaced when it was worn out. This principle, though sound for machinery, plants and other depreciating things which wear out, fails to work with respect to depleting things

such as oil and the minerals in the ground. A simple illustration: If a man in some manufacturing business buys a piece of equipment for \$100,000, he can take depreciation deductions over its useful life. By the time the machine is worn out he will have accumulated a reserve to cover its original cost and have the money to buy a re-

It's not that simple for a mineral producer. Suppose an oil man has a producing property that cost him \$100,000 and suppose the tax law permitted him to recover only that investment cost. The laws would, in effect, be putting him out of business because he could not take the \$100,000 recovered from a successful discovery and expect to go out and drill a replacement. For every 100 new-field wildcat wells drilled, only 9.72 per cent

Odds of one to nine are pretty high risks - particularly when an average cost of drilling a land well, dry hole or not, is \$76,000.

The average marine well costs \$556,000 to drill, and on the Alaska north slope, the cost per well averages more than \$1.75 million.

TAX LAWS HAVE to be based on realities if we are to have a workable system of taxation. And the odds against success in exploring for oil and other mineral exploration had to be recognized by Congress in applying the income tax laws to these industries.

So, rather than being a "loophole" and giving the petroleum industry an undue advantage, the mineral depletion allowance simply counteracts to some extent the tremendous disadvantage entailed in the high risk, high cost search for new oil and new gas reserves.

America needs these reserves if we are going to avoid energy crises. We already import 23 per cent of our oil, and experts tell us that the figure will be 57 per cent by 1985 unless something is done to encourage oil exploration within this

The fraud of secrecy grows worse

mer Schoolcraft College board chairman; John Markes (D-Westland), former city council president; Tom Brown (D-Westland), former mayor and township supervisor; and William Keith (D-Garden City), former school board member.

Only Ray Smit (R-Ann Arbor) never held a local office among our area state reps. They all voted for the bill and are herewith chided.





Shopping floor space increases 5 per cent

Consumers have been given five per cent more space to shop for retail items in the past five years, according to a report released by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

Since 1968, the Southeast Michigan region has gained 5.6 million square feet of new shopping center floor space, an increase of five per cent. The increase was from a total of 23 million square feet of retail center floor space in 1968 to almost 29 million square feet in 1973.

Another significant finding is that construction of "supercenters" - centers of one million square feet or more - has abated in the region.

From 1963 - 68, the supercenter share of retail floor space construction climbed from 27 to 37 per cent for a 10 per cent growth factor. Since 1968. however, supercenters account for only 40 per cent of all shopping center space in the region - a growth factor of only three per cent over

Partially explaining this trend is the diminishing availability of large tracts of land to support a supercenter, and growing opposition by local residents to regional centers - as evidenced by citizen groups fighting regional centers in the Plymouth, Farmington Hills, West Bloomfield and Novi areas in recent years.

The retail space study fits into SEMCOG's overall responsibility to develop and coordinte regionwide planning for land use, transportation, recreation and open space, water supply, sewage disposal and storm drainage, criminal justice, manpower development and housing.

SEMCOG is a voluntary association of governments composed of elected officials from 96 communities in the counties of Oakland, Wayne, Macomb, Washtenaw, Livingston, St. Clair and Monroe.

The study broke down retail space into the following categories:

Central business district - a commercial district including the central-

ized financial and governmental functions of a city with at least one general merchandise store with more than 50,000 square feet of floor space:

Regional shopping center — a shopping complex with at least 500,000 square feet of floor space, at least one general merchandise store of more than 50,000 square feet, at least six retail establishments in all, and at least 2.000 off street parking spaces:

Community shopping center — a shopping complex with at least one general merchandise store of at least 50,000 square feet, with at least one other retail or service establishment;

General merchandise store - a retail establishment with at least 50,000 square feet of floor space, not associcenter, dealing in apparel and accessories, furniture and appliances and other household goods.

Three of the centers, Somerset Mall in Oakland County, New Center area in Detroit, and Riverview Plaza in St. Clair don't have general merchanidise parking for 5,000 cars. stores but were included in the shopping center categories because of their uniqueness and magnitude in relation to their surrounding areas.

The only central business districts identified in the SEMCOG study were: the CBD in Detroit with J.L. Hudson and Crowley; Birmingham with Crowley and Jacobson's; Pontiac; Mt. Clemens, Ann Arbor with Sears, Penney, Ward, Jacobson's; Monroe with Penney, Sears; Port Huron, Penney, Ward, Sears; and Flint, (100,000 square feet and 1,150 parking Penney and Ward.

Wayne County regional centers include: Eastland, J.L. Hudson; Fairlane in Dearborn, under construction: Livonia Mall, Crowley and Sears; Southland, Hudson's: Westland, Hudson's; and, Wonderland, Wards and Federal.

Livonia Mall, at Seven Mile and Middle Belt, has 770,000 square feet of floor space and parking space for 4.500 cars. Westland Center, at Warren and Wayne Roads, has 787,705 square feet of floor space and parking for 5,140 cars. Wonderland has 650,000 square feet of floor space and is expanding, and parking space for 5,000 cars. Westland also has announced expansion plans.

Northland Center, at 8 Mile and Northwestern, 1.38 million square feet of floor space and parking for 10,500 cars. The Northland J.C. Penney store is expected to be completed this year to add 330,000 square feet of floor space to the Northland complex.

Oakland Mall, at 14 Mile and John ated with a community or regional R, has 1.2 million square feet of retail space and parking 'for 7,500 cars. Somerset Mall, at Big Beaver and Coolidge, has 350,000 square feet floor space and parking for 2,400 cars. Tel -Twelve, at Telegraph and 12 Mile, has 500,000 square feet retail space and

For central business districts: Detroit has 7.2 million square feet of retail floor space: Birmingham has 782,000 square feet of floor space; Mt. Clemens, 240,000 square feet; Ann Arbor, 631,000 square feet; Monroe, 240,000 square feet: Port Huron, 1.2 million square feet; and Flint, one million square feet retail floor space.

K - Mart in Rochester (124,000 square feet and 800 parking spaces; Kendallwood Center, Crowley, in Farmington Hills (138,000 square feet and 1,000 parking spaces; Southfield Plaza, Korvette and Federal, (268,000 square feet and 1,800 parking spaces); and, Topps in Farmington Hills (120,000 square feet and 1,000 parking

There were no general merchandise stores from Observer & Eccentric communities listed in the SEMCOG report. A general merchandise store scheduled to open this year, however, is Meijers Thrifty Acres at Canton Center and Ford Roads in Canton Township with 250,000 sqaure feet floor space and parking for 1,500 cars.

Farmington Towne at Grand River and Halstead is a community shopping center under construction to feature a K - Mart store and have 160,000 square feet floor space and 839 parking spaces when opened this year.

There is also a regional shopping center under construction in Novi at Novi Road and I - 96 to contain one million square feet of floor space.

In Wayne County, most of the total retail floor space can be found in community shopping centers while in Oakland County the majority is in regional shopping centers. Regionwide, community shopping centers are most common followed by central business districts and then regional shopping

Preparation of the retail space study was financed in part through grants from the U.S. Department of Transportation and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The answers may come out of a meeting scheduled Saturday when top management of the Detroit Racing Association operation of the DRC meeting, meet with union officials to discuss the problems of Sunday rac-

Perhaps the biggest one, since the Legislature already has approved Sabbath programs for the thoroughbreds, will come from the unions. The big stumbling block is going to be an expected demand from the mutuel clerks for double time for Sundays.

'Tis known union members passed around petitions late last week indicating they would only work on a double time basis and many didn't care to work at all on Sundays.

SHOULD THIS BE TRUE, and apparently it is since the track management admits that such petitions have been signed by the mutuel clerks, then an impasse could result and result in no Sunday races at the DRC track this year.

After all, there are only five or six Sundays left in the meeting and management, which already is facing a lot of red ink in 1974, may not feel it can afford to risk adding more expense when it doesn't have any idea what Sabbath racing will bring:



Presidential tapes are essential

says youngest member of impeachment panel

His speech, titled "Politics and Ethics," didn't mention President Nixon or Watergate. His delivery - a crowd-pleasing blend of jokes, anecdotes, boyish grins and flashes of deep blue eyes — tended to soften the significance of his position.

Yet, inescapably, the questions from the audience focused on one topic: The possibility that the President of the United States would be impeached.

U. S. Rep. William S. Cohen, a Republican from Maine, arrived fresh from a morning appearance on CBS-TV's "Face the Nation" to

Reuther raps Esch 'no' vote on energy act

John Reuther, candidate for the Democratic nomination for 2nd District Congress, recently criticized incumbent Marvin Esch (R - Ann Arbor) for voting against the Standby **Energy Emergency Act.**

Speaking to a group of supporters at a house party in Livonia, Reuther labelled the 207 - 191 defeat another "victory for the oil lobby and a defeat for consumers."

Among other provisions, the bill would have rolled petroleum prices back to November 1973 levels and would have provided \$500 million in unemployment assistance to those who were unemployed as a result of , energy shortages.

"PRESIDENT Nixon didn't want the bill to pass because of the price rollback and neither did Esch apparently. It seems incredible to me that we must still bow down to the oil interests," said Reuther.

"Exxon under - reported its profit by some \$400 million. When Gulf was shown to be giving out false figures, even the Federal Energy Administration began to think seriously about a rollback. Incredibly, Esch still thinks the oil companies need more

"Reports of other economists such as Walter Heller indicate that this type of bill would have eliminated the need for an excess profits tax, which would be cumbersome and probably easily evaded by the oil companies. It would give \$6 billion back to the consumer who now pours it into the oil company coffers.

"Every consumer should remember Esch's vote when he is paying exorbitant fuel costs, and every person who becomes unemployed for energy related reasons should remember the \$500 million that won't be available because of votes like his.

I'M SURE Esch will produce some bill or other he has introduced to cure the unemployment problem, or the energy problem, but votes are what

"Hr voted against the price rollback, against the \$500 million for unemployment. That vote means more than bills thrown in the legislative hopper to die.

"Esch supported the president 75 per cent of the time during the last quarter at the expense of the consumer," said Reuther, "He is obviously going to continue."

The Standby Energy Emergency Act was supported by the Consumer Federation of America and other such

speak at the Birmingham Unitarian Church Sunday. The youngest member of the House Judiciary, which is currently investigating possible impeachable offenses of the President, Cohen found the same questions at both stops.

Receptiveness needed-Pierce

Dr. Ed Pierce, who is seeking the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 2nd District, stated after a day's campaign jaunt through Monroe County recently that he's convinced "this isn't going to be the year of the slick politicians.

Pierce, an MD, is campaigning in the 2nd District which covers a broad area including Livonia, Plymouth, Monroe and Washtenaw counties.

'The people of Monroe County have the same kind of concerns all residents of this district do," says Pierce. "They're angry about politicians who don't produce, about inflation, about the fact nobody wants to listen to or do anything about their very real problems.

"I asked people in Monroe if their current representative had been around lately. They said yes, he had been out at the country club talking to the Republican women. But most people around here don't happen to frequent country clubs.

"I also met an elderly man, a man sick with emphysema who lives on a very limited pension. He had his Medicaid card taken away, and he couldn't understand why. He hasn't seen his congressman around to talk to him either.'

Pierce went door - to - door campaigning with local aids in several areas of the city of Monroe. He discussed city problems with Monroe's mayor, particularly about the water referendum in the city on the ballot Aug. 6.

Pierce then toured the local Ford plant, where he talked with workers about their jobs, working conditions. and economic hardships under in-

Reuther's dad hits joblessness in Livonia talk

Victor Reuther ranked full employment as an issue-which should receive high national priority in a speech given in Livonia recently in support of his son's candidacy in the 2nd Congressional District.

The elder Reuther, retired director of the international affairs department of the UAW, was guest speaker at the formal opening of the Reuther for Congress headquarters in Livonia.

IT WAS his first appearance on behalf of his son's campaign. John Reuther is a Democratic candidate for the nomination in the 2nd District. which includes Livonia and Plymouth. The candidate's father, who has

played an integral role in the labor movement for the past 40 years, spoke of "immediate goals" facing the nation today and ranked the need of obtaining full employment high on his list of priorities.

He also called on Congress to "plug the many loopholes which exist in the present tax system and allow the wealthy to pay less in taxes than the average American." He also called for a comprehensive health care system for every American.

THE ELDER Reuther also cited the "archaic transportation system" and the national environment as needs which must be met in the near future.

Before his father spoke, the candidate called upon his supporters to help in the effort of providing new leadership in the 94th Congress.

"We can no longer afford a representative who prefers to follow the Nixon lead. We need change. We need tax reform now. When the President pays less in taxes than all but the very poor, when multinational oil companies pay ridiculously small amounts, and 267 persons who earned more than \$100,000 last year paid nothing, we need reform.'

Limit spending on presidential homes - Egnor

Ron Egnor, candidate for the Democratic nomination for. 2nd District Congress, has urged incumbent-Rep. Marvin Esch (R - Ann Arbor) to support legislation proposed by the House Government Operations Committee limiting public spending on presiden-

Egnor recently told a group of supporters in Ypsilanti: "Since he has been in office, Richard Nixon has spent in excess of \$17 million in taxpayers' money on his homes in San Clemente and Key Biscayne, as well as the residence of his daughter in Maryland and the Bahamas estate of his friend Robert Abplanalp.'

THE OUTLAYS, according to the Government Services Administration (GSA), went for a variety of uses, ranging from installation of security devices to flag poles and landscaping.

"These sorts of expenditures aren't defensible for any chief executive. I can fully understand a president's need for a suitable residence, ample office space and, even a retreat to escape the pressures of his position. for

Cohen defended fellow commit- move President Nixon from office shouldn't be expected until after this November's Congressional elections.

Defining his version of an impeachable offense, he said, "It would be an act or a series of acts that resulted in dishonor, disgrace or calumny to the office of the President.'

Cohen had high praise for the way the judiciary has conducted its investigation thus far.

"It has been a non-partisan pursuit of the truth," he said of the investigation. "I have complete confidence in (chairman) Peter Rodino. He is a fair, extremely patient and decent man who has bent over backwards to keep the investigation non-partisan.'

COHEN, ALSO praised the man standing in the wings should President Nixon be removed, Vice-President Gerald Ford.

"He is open, honest and accessible," Cohen said. "He doesn't isolate or insulate himself from the people. He is just the opposite of what we've had.'

The Maine Republican said he didn't think the President should

"As painful as it is, impeachment is the way we have to go," he said. "The issue is so emotional and the country has been so polarized, there is no other way to resolve this.'

Asked when an impeachment trial might be conducted in the Senate, Cohen said, "Thank God, we only have to decide the future. not to predict it."

Cohen admitted that Watergate could hurt his chances for a second term. He said no matter how he votes on impeachment, he will be hurt. Threats have even been made on his life pending his final vote,

AT ANY RATE, he says his two years in Washington, D.C. have been eventful.

"I couldn't have crammed more into two years," he shrugged.

During that time, he said he has had to consider votes to cut off funds in Southeast Asia, a war powers clause, investigation of a successor to Vice-President Spiro Agnew and now impeachment.

Cohen, who looks younger than his 33 years, recalls the initial impact he had in Washington.
Arriving on the House floor for

the first time, he was mistaken for a page and asked to deliver a message to the Speaker of the House. Arriving at an elevator near the House chambers, the operator asked hopefully, "Are you here to replace me?"



Recycle materials for compost

Because of the fertilizer shortage this year and rising prices, wise gardeners are recycling their organic materials for use as fertilizers.

Compost piles provide a convenient way to dispose of your garden waste materials and provide your plants with needed nutrition, say Michigan State University horticulturists.

All garden materials are good for composting, including leaves, grass clippings, sawdust, woodchips, old vines and weeds-even kitchen scraps. Avoid using meat scraps because they may attract mice or rats.

Keep the pile moist.

THE LENGTH of time for decomposing materials varies from six, weeks to six months or more. To hasten decomposing, turn the pile over two or three times at two-week intervals. Turning also reduces odors.

A simplified procedure, but one that takes longer, is to pile the material to be composted adding small amounts

of commercial fertilizer or animal manure as the pile is built up. Turn over and water occasionally. This method may require two or more years before complete decomposition

If your compost is ready before you plant your spring garden spread it over the soil and rototill it into the soil. Throughout the growing season, mix vour compost with topsoil and spread it over your flower beds. around shrubs and in your vegetable garden as you would a mulch.

Partially decomposed materials may be plowed into the soil in the fall to complete decomposing by the following spring.

Businesswomen have own directory

"A Woman for All Seasons" would have been a shorter name for a recently published booklet titled "The 1973 - 74 Directory of Women in Business. Professions. Education, Industry, Science, Arts" (Metropolitan Detroit Area.)

But it would not have been nearly as specific.

Three women from Livonia, one from Garden City and one who works in Westland are included in this 44 page directory designed to serve as a yellow pages' listing of women in the area.

The book includes women who are doing business under their own names or their own firm names and who are working in part or full time occupations.


It also features the names of women who have been hired by businesses for responsible, decision - making positions and who have to be reached by the public.

The work of the Livonia. Westland and Garden City women included in the booklet ranges from selling cars or clothes, to managing a branch bank, painting with watercolors, or preparing advertising and public rela-

tions campaigns.

Nikki Shelly sells cars. What may be even more surprising, she sells trucks, too. For two and a half years she has worked for Crestwood Dodge in Garden City and has liked her job very much.

GRACE HAY works with advertising layouts and flags.



"I like talking to people." she explained. "and I like the fact that the job doesn't tie me down to one spot. I often deliver a new car to its owner or go to a place of business to sign the final papers for a car a customer is too busy to come here.

"I saw an advertisement in the paper for this job. Since it didn't menfion a sex preference, I applied."

She has learned a lot. Mrs. Shelly said. She even went for a time to truck school where she learned to toss around terms like "gross vehicle weight" and "payload."

Some of the customers who come in the showroom are surprised to see a woman selling cars. "But only once did a customer refuse to deal with a woman," she recalled.

"People ask me if I am doing this because I am a women's libber," she said, "but I tell them I am just doing my job. Women seem to resist buying from me a little more than men and I think that is because women come in not knowing much about cars. They feel they can learn more from men."

Of course, some days Mrs. Shelly becomes depressed when the selling has not been going well. But basically she feels she is doing fine. "I have sold more this month than I sold last year at this time."

She enjoys working with the men at the establishment and thinks that she has a small edge on them with the mechanics. who give her extra help because she is a woman.

As far as what customers are most interested in today in cars. Mrs. Shelly says it is "gas mileage."

In quite a different field is Mrs. Electra Stamelos of Livonia. When she is working on one of the water colors she sells through the Habatat Galleries in Dearborn, she works by herself with little contact with people.

"Since I was a kid I always wanted to be an artist," she said.

With the help of a scholarship from the National Art School in Washington, she seemed well on her way to becoming a costume designer when a family tragedy occurred.

Her father died and she had to go to work.

"Fortunately I could type so I supported myself as a secretary." she explained. "But after I married, my husband suggested that I quit work and return to art."

Like a shot she was off to the Society of Arts and Crafts in Detroit, transferring later to Wayne State University.

At the present time Mrs. Stamelos is concentrating on water colors.Her pictures of flowers have proved to be her most popular subjects.

Even though art is her great love, she pointed out that the work on these flowers was "agony," for her. "The work has to be very con-

trolled," she said
"But I feel very frustrated when I

can't get to it," she said, "and I stay up until three or four in the morning working. I have to do it that way or I'd never get anything done."

She would like to be a portrait painter and is already a teacher.

"When I teach, I tell my students all the rules and tell them they can break them, but they have to break them the right way," she smiled.

"Actually the best way to learn is by trial and error. Then they find out what works best for them."

In recent months Mrs. Stamelos has been wrenched from her easel through involvement in preserving the Wilson dairy barn at Middle Belt and Chicago in Livonia.

A friend of the barn, which has been designated as a state and national historic site, Mrs. Stamelos is spending every spare hour to save this building for Livonia. Like its other friends, she longs to see it used as a center for the arts.

Every spare hour, that is, except for the ones she will now spend as recently appointed member of Livonia's new art commission.

"Our hope is to enrich the cultural life of the community," she said, "so the public will feel the arts have a place in Livonia."

"Nothing replaces more than 20 years of experience," claimed Mrs. Grace Gordon Hay, whose bag is advertising and public relations.

"By now I think I have developed a sixth sense for the psychology of promotion and advertising and I know what people like and want. I know what will tell a story," she said.

From an office in her home, Mrs. Hay has been directing her own agency for 18 years. Prior to that she was a partner in a St. Louis, Mo., advertising agency, a copy chief for Buster Brown shoes and an art director in the promotion department of the Washington Post.

She has found little conflict between her job and her role of a mother. "My time was often flexible so that I could make room for family life," she observed.

"In fact, there were some things my daughter loved about my job. I used to take her to trade shows in Chicago and she loved eating in restaurants with clients," she added.

"In my work," she said, "I like planning and carrying through an entire advertising concept for a company. I visualize the art work, layout and the copy at the same time."

For five and a half years Mrs. Hay has handled the local advertising for Hearthside furniture. She also places ads in national magazines for companies selling by mail.

Currently she also is in the flag business. On a mail order basis, her firm promotes and sells replicas of historic flags including the Betsy Ross flag and the flag carried through the Battle of Bennington, as well as the traditional stars and stripes.

"I think advertising and public relations is a great field for women," she said. "A number of my friends have been very successful free lancing part - time as writers or artists."

The main satisfaction Pat Bevak of Livonia finds in her job is dealing with many different kinds of people. Selling clothes through parties in women's homes, Mrs. Bevak finds that "I never know who I am going to encounter and I enjoy it."

When her children were small, she joined an organization called Queen's





Women should be ready for widowhood

"With 56 the average age for widowhood, many women will spend from 20 - 30 years alone." said Dr. Virginia VanCoevering at the seminar called "Alone Again" at Schoolcraft

"They should, therefore, prepare themselves in advance for this experience." she added.

Having earned her doctorate in work on widows. Dr. VanCoevering advised the members of her audience to practice decision making in advance. Learn to set goals, even small ones, and then try to achieve them.

"Try to feel good about yourself and vour own identity." she suggested. "Develop self discipline. Take up an avocation and use some of your time learning how to earn your own liv-

To her listeners, most of whom were widows, she urged that they "get up off their chairs and meet life. For every single person there is a place."

She also cautioned them that "A woman alone is frequently regarded by married people as an oddity and often as a menace. You will have to understand and accept the all pervasive distrust of single women in our society." she said.

Requesting answers from her audience on what they believed were their basic human drives, she was told they wanted to feel happy and secure, to feel needed, to be liked by somebody, to have friends, to be at peace with themselves and to have some fun and adventure in their lives.

Such supportive socializing had been advocated by Dr. VanCoevering during both of her lectures in the program. "If a group of widows comes along, join it," she urged. "Discuss with them, work on your problems together. It is a tremendous way to get acquainted and get a feeling of com-

Groups of widows, she feels should also lobby for governmental aid to widows along such lines as employment counseling, tuition payments to enable widows to receive schooling and special training courses.

She also believes a governmental agency could find a way to make use of the talents of older women willing to serve as foster grandmothers or perhaps earn a little money looking after the children of working mothers in those few hours after school before the mothers come home.

Dr. VanCoevering also put forth several specific suggestions as to how widows could improve their lot in small but useful ways.

"Start a one - drawer filing cabinet." she said. "Then keep in some systematic way safety and consumer tips. Include in it all the places you' can get help - from the plumber to the police."

She added: "Save advice on how to manage money. Put in your cabinet all your income tax material, your canceled checks and medical informa-

"Don't turn in your credit card," she warned. "It is hard to get one later. Keeping it you will be able to travel without carrying much cash. Besides, if you pay your bills promptly, it will give you a chance to build up your own credit rating.

"Join a health group," she counseled. "Many widows enjoy having some regular activity to count on, and you will feel much better if you are in good physical shape."

Dr. VanCoevering also believes that widows should not permit themselves to drop out of their social group. Accept your social obligations and don't keep saying you feel like staying at home. Such action will only place you in a rut, she said.

While several of her audience nodded in agreement, she reminded them that in time they would be albe to be alone in a healthy, unlonely way.

"Try instead to do something with your life, about which your husband would be proud," she concluded. "I sincerely believe a woman can do anything she wants to do, if she just wants to do it badly enough."

The final session of this series will be May 30 at 8 p.m. in the liberal arts building at Schoolcraft.

At Schoolcraft, cooking is a growing art

Food, glorious food.

There it sits in the kitchen of Schoolcraft College. Cauldrons of shrimp, vats of chocolate. Down the counters in neat columns march endless rows of French pastries.

It is enough to cause trembling in the stomach and boggling in the mind.

Over it all presides Robert Breithaupt. director of culinary arts and services. Moving through the kitchen among the students of the art of cooking are his three chef instructors - surprisingly slender considering the temptations to which they are daily subjected.

Richard Hans Benson, one chef instructor, is asking several students to get those knives flashing to dice uo onions for one of the dinners that the department now caters at the college.

"After two years of peeling onions. I have finally stopped crying," says Doug Smith, one of the students, to a friend.

Leonard Stec. the pastry instructor is examining a cauldron of whipped egg whites which is standing next to that vat of chocolate. He speaks the magic word. "Mix."

Chocolate unites with egg whites in holy matrimony with the issue of the union eventually to be chocolate chiffon pie.

Around a corner of the kitchen stands James Van Vuren, chef instructor in gourmet cooking and advanced quality food preparation.

The students under his direction are preparing a dinner that will include gazspacho. sea food crepes and other items too mouthwatering to mention.

Sauteing the tenderloin is Francis Lamongie, who several years ago finished an apprenticeship in meat cutting in Aix - en - Province, a town near Marseilles. France. Love has brought him in a roundabout way to Schoolcraft.

With a two - year waiting list for admission to this department, the Schoolcraft administration has been doing some serious thinking about expanding the program.

One of the matters to be discussed at the May 8 study session of the board of trustees will be the specific architectural changes involved in such an expansion, and of course,

"Students who leave here after completing the full course in culinary arts obtain jobs with pay ranging from \$8.000 to \$12,000," said Breithaupt who has been with the college for close to nine years.

"They go the country clubs, major hotel chains, better restaurants; and to air line caterers. Some go into mid management positions. Other go into positions that will lead eventually to that of executive chef. Entry jobs are usually those of night, cook, second cook or saute man."

The term saute man is being used these days to replace the more chloresterol - sounding title of fry cook.

During the first semester in culinary arts and food service, the students learn the basics of cooking. They must learn how to handle a knife without the necessity of calling for medical assistance. They must acquire techniques of cutting onions and others garnishes at a rate of speed equal to the large number of mouths

They will discover the components of sauces and methods for operating food preparation machines.

The newer students spend four hours a day, five days a week in the I met an American girl and mar- kitchen, usually in the afternoon when dent chefs.

been studying the art of cooking at come in at 7 a.m. to prepare and serve all the food made for students, faculty, staff and special parties. They will be putting into practice techniques learned earlier.

> At this point they will be working under pressure because food deadlines must be met.

Later they will be split into three five - week periods for intensive study quantity food preparation, advanced food preparation and baking

If after a year, a student finds a talent for a particular speciality welling up in his fingers. he' may ask for a longer assignment to pastries or sauces or whatever interests him.

By the third semester he is given a grief assignment as an under chef with more responsibility in planning

Each student has at least a week as the job overseer in formulating menus, calculating food and labor costs and watching over the serving

Many of the students take their new knowledge and skills from the college kitchen to evening jobs in other restuarants in the area. They are employed in such establishments as the Drawbridge in Northville, the Mayflower Hotel and the Hillside Inn in Plymouth, the Sun Dog in Dearborn, the Shiawassee Hotel and Raleigh House in Southfield, the Country Club of Detroit in Grosse Point and the **Detroit Country Club.**

For an even broader experience with food preparation, the students of culinary arts also cater a limited number of banquets of various organizations in the Waterman Capus Cen-

Drawn by the growing reputation of the cuisine, organizations such as the Livonia League of Women Voters, the Optimist club and even Little League groups have been delightedly offering themselves as guinea pigs to the stu-

The only other woman in the program, Alice Fularczyk of Livonia, has taken up cooking because of its portability. A former teacher, she was working on a master's degree in guidance and counseling at Purdue University when her husband was trans-

"In the food business, you can get a job anywhere," she claimed.


