Borowski, Lawton, Berry, Yack win election

Mrs. Borowski and Lawton, who finarnong five candidates, won four year board terms.

Berry and Yack, who ran first and second respectively separated by six votes, beat out nine other candidates for the two one - year terms on the board.

Two incumbents, Joe Gray, who was running for a four - year term, and Tom Turner, running for a one-year term, were unseated in the elections Monday.

In the race for the two four - year terms, the candidates finished in the following order: Mrs. Borowski, 3,015; Lawton, 2,423; Gray, 2,384; John Hib-



Cape, 617; John Blumenshine, 516; Cyril Nichols, 382; James Somers, 371; Thomas Yanus Jr., 261; and Robert Hubbert, 251.

The new First National Bank of Plymouth, which has been on the planning boards for several months pending approval from the U.S. Comptroller of the Currency, may be open for business in late September.

Charles Heidt, president of the first local bank to be organized in the Plymouth community in more then 20 years, was optimistic about the opening date after receiving word that the Comptroller of Currency had granted preliminary approval to the organiza-

The initial announcement of the approval was made by Northern States Bancorporation of which First National of Plymouth will become a wholly , cent to the Mayflower Meeting House

owned subsidiary. First National will operate under local management with a local board of directors.

Benjamin H. Paddock III, president of Northern States, said, "We are pleased with the preliminary approval of the First National Bank of Plymouth. With optimal conditions — such as speedy approval from the state and a quick sale of the bonds — the high school addition could be under way by Sept. 1 and the three elementary schools could be started by early fall. Supt. John M. Hoben said that even

with the issue's passage and a speedy start on the schools, construction lag time would still cause a crunch during the 1975 - 76 school year.

Construction of the new buildings is expected to take two years, thus opening them in time for the 1976 - 77 school year.

The high school addition will include physical education and music facilities as well as more classrooms. It will increase Plymouth - Canton's ca-

The elementary schools will probably be built in the Windsor Park area, on the present Truesdell School site and in the area bounded by Cherry Hill, Haggerty, Ford and Lilley Roads.

Final approval of the sites has yet to come from the school board and McClendon said it might take extra meetings of the board to expedite the schools' construction process.

He added that the board would watch the 45 - 15 year round school program soon to begin at Miller Ele-

Ray Smit leaving House but may join Milliken

Is State Rep. Ray Smit going to be Gov. William Milliken's running mate on the Republican ticket in Novem-

Smit's own background and answers point to a strong "maybe."

Smit (R-Ann Arbor) announced this week he will decline to seek re-election from his rambling district that includes eastern Washtenaw County, the City of Plymouth and most of Plymouth Township in Wayne County.

Former Rep. Roy Smith of Ypsilanti indicated Wednesday he would move into Smit's 52nd House District and seek to succeed Smit. The announcements were made simultaneously, indicating that Smith knew of Smit's plans well in advance.

"I HAVE NO immediate political plans," said Smit, who said he plans to join the Ann Arbor engineering firm of McNamee, Porter and Seeley when he leaves the Legislature Jan. 1.

"Future political plans will have to wait for future political developments," he said.

Asked directly about speculation that either he or U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) will be Milliken's running mate, Smit replied:

"As far as I know, Marv is not going to be a candidate for lieutenant

Will Smit be the candidate for lieutenant governor? He answered: "I don't know. That's in the future. It's so remote right now that I'm not thinking about it."

WHILE SMIT was busy not thinking about it, political insiders in Lansing said Milliken has narrowed the field to three names. But it was unknown whether Smit's was among them.

The Republican State Convention will nominate candidates for lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, four education boards and Supreme Court following the Aug. 6 primary. In 1970 it was an "open" convention except for the No. 2 spot. Milliken hand-picked James Brickley and announced his request many weeks in advance. Brickley was nominated without a murmur of opposi-

Milliken is reportedly looking for a Becky Thatcher look-alike contests.

lieutenant governor from southeastern Michigan to balance his ticket geographically. Ideally, the candidate would be close to Milliken's own political philosophy, and a good campaigner with some ethnic or Catholic ap-

This newspaper's source of political gossip was a person who had reported (1) that Esch would be considered, which turned out to be true for several weeks; (2) that Smit would not seek re-election, which turned out to be true; (3) that Smith would move into the 52nd District and run there, which at this writing appears to be coming true; and (4) that Smit would be picked for lieutenant governor.

SMIT, 45, was first elected to the House in 1966 and has a reputation on environmental legislation. He has a master's degree in civil engineering from the University of Michigan.

In four terms, Smit sponsored more than 40 new laws, including the water pollution bond issue, new municipal finance laws, a new wilderness program, improved solid waste disposal laws, and others. He is a member of the House Committee on Conservation and Recreation.



Is it so remote?

Smith, 50, is a former Ypsilanti Township supervisor who was elected to the House for the first time in 1966. Reapportionment put him into the new 22nd District, and he was defeated by a Democrat in 1972.

PLYMOUTH—In a quiet, hardly noticeable move, the Plymouth Board of Education passed a motion which could trigger an exciting bicentennial commemorative.

The board unanimously approved a motion by Marda Benson directing the administration to study the ramifications of restoring Canton Center school as an historic site and facility.

The idea came to light when the board was asked to approve the renewal of the \$1 a year lease on the school to Canton Township. The township uses the schoolhouse for commumity and recreation purposes.

Yockey did tell the authority board that if the townships and the school district combined to form an authority without the city, the city would "offer full support and cooperation."

The city commission rejected the authority agreement last fall, saying it did not favor a disolvement clause which was included in an ammended form of the agreement.

Oldford said the authority - even if formed without the city - would

serve all residents of the school dis-

"We're not saying you have to live just in the townships to be in the programs," he said:

The board acting chairman added that although there has been a change on the city commission since the election last November, Yockey indicated there was no change in the city's position on joining.

Oldford said that since the authority idea was first discussed, both Plymouth and Canton townships have made several additions to their recreation programs and developed more recreational facilities.

"We thirk this (the recreation authority) is the best and most effective way to use those facilities," he added.

Township gives L&D 60 days to lower fill dirt level

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—The Plymouth Township Board is giving L. & D. Texaco 60 days to lower the level of fill dirt on a site next to its service station at Ridge and Ann Arbor Roads.

The L. & D. plan approved by the board Tuesday calls for lowering the height of the fill by about three feet at its highest point and by two feet on most of the rest of the property which adjoins the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Chester Budzynski of 9125 Ridge Rd.

The dirt would be graded toward Ann Arbor Road and sloped away from the Budzynski property.

The area under fill is intended as the possible site of a new Texaco service station replacing the existing structure at the Ridge and Ann Arbor Road corner. L. & D. Texaco is owned by Lewis Hoffman and Dennis Rich-

Edward Draugelis, attorney for L. & D., told the board that grading some of the fill up to the Ann Hrbor Road side of the property would limit the chance of future overflow onto the Budzynski parcel.

"Our chief concerns are height and drainage," said Leon Spence, an attorney representing the Budzynskis. "The plan does not indicate any method of properly handling drainage."

According to Draugelis, the new proposal would lower the fill from 824.2 feet above sea level at its highest point to 821.3 feet, drop of nearly three feet. Average drop on the property adjacent to the Budzynskis would be about two feet.

'This will create drainage toward Ann Arbor Road," Draugelis told the

TIV BALOGH of 49800 Joy Rd., cited a passage in the township ordinance which he said showed L. & D. was in error with its current landfill: "Any grading on a lot shall not divert surface water to adjoining lots.

"This is a residential area," he ar-

gued. "It is no different as far as ecological use than a subdivision is." According to Spence, the fill piled

next to the Budzynskis property includes discarded appliances and broken Draugelis assured the board that

the proposed plan would adequately relieve the current problem. "The end result will not be so drastic as some people here fear," he said.

"L. & D. did dump in excess of what I personally think is necessary," said Township Treasurer Elizabeth Holmes.

Herbert Lazurus of 49720 Joy Rd. said that approving the L. & D. proposal might mean approving the site for future commercial use even though it has yet to be zoned com- fully carried out.

"L. & D's intention is that the area be graded and landscaped,"said Mrs. Holmes. "I'm willing to give them a chance to do this before we even get to the matter of a new gas station."

At the urging of Trustee Gerald Burke, the board set a 60-day/time limit for the re-grading. Draugelis estimated that L. & D. would need about 45 days to complete the project.



PLYMOUTH - The first school in Plymouth Township was in a log house built a few years before 1830. It stood on Shattuck Hill on Plymouth Road near the present Hillside Inn and opposite the entrance to Riverside Cemetery.

The disciplinarians who ruled in that and the other eight rustic schools in the community's early years would have pleased those among today's parents who agree with C. S. Lewis that "the current has been setting toward license" during our lifetime.

If any children were spoiled during the territorial era in Plymouth, it was certainly not because the rod was spared.

Standard equipment for teachers in pioneer communities included a heavy ruler for cracking the knuckles of indolent pupils. A birch rod was used for more stringent punishment. A teacher not able to handle the biggest boy in his class usually looked for another vocation.

than formerly," Johnson observed in 1775, "but there is less learned there; so that what the boys get at one end they lose at the other.

Plymouth settlers who came from New England and New York knew the value of education. Their interest in schools was further stimulated by a Territorial law passed in 1827.

It required every township with 50 or more inhabitants to employ a schoolmaster "of good morals to teach reading, writing, English, French, arithmetic, spelling and decent behavoir." Presumably those at home in the 1820s were no better equipped to teach acceptable social

conduct than the parents of today. Schools were supported by tuition, not taxes. Children of poor parents could attend free, but pride kept some such as Samuel Johnson. "There is of them away. There were no free

Our examination was made primarily for the purpose of rendering an opinion on these basic financial statements, taken as a whole. The supplementary financial data identified in the contents, although not considered necessary for a fair presentation of financial position and results of operations, are presented primarily for supplemental analysis purposes. This additional information has been subjected to the audit procedures applied in the examination of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

Our report of comments and recommendations dated May 15, 1974, has been submitted under separate cover.

Representatives of the Plymouth Hockey Association appeared at the Monday night meeting to ask the board to reaffirm its position of a year ago to establish hockey as a varsity sport for both boys and girls. Board approval for the 1973-74 year fell by the wayside because of lack of

Dr. Wendell Hough led the discussion with the board, saying in behalf of hockey, "Students are being denied the opportunity to play something they very much like."

Hough also told the board that he doubted if the high schools could play league hockey in the first year since the schedules have already been established. He said he felt that there would be "no problem in identifying high school teams to play with, but not in league competition."

Trustee George Lawton moved that a committee be formed to come back to the board with recommendations for a hockey program in the high schools next fall. He suggested that Hough and Robert Myrtle, president of the hockey association, be committee members along with someone from the administration appointed by the superintendent.

Hough asked Lawton if the intent of the motion was to implement the program and Lawton said it was.

Marda Benson was the only board member who didn't favor the motion saying she was not interested in seeing the hockey program implemented, "until a learning disabilities program, until the 45-15 curriculum is further along....'

Hough agreed with Trustee Gary dirto that the intent is to make the hockey program self-sustaining. .

In other action, the board approved time changes for the Miller elementary school for the period from July 22 to Aug. 23. The schedule for the school which will be on the year around 45-15 program will be a half hour earlier with starting time at 8:30 a.m. and closing time at 3 p.m.

Supt. John M. Hoben told the board there has been no action on the recommended boundary changes for Miller, Central, Pioneer and East Middle







Children who need some special help in life showed their accomhments to Michigan's lawmakers Tuesday, June 4, in a display in the rotunda of the Capitol. Speaker of the House William Ryan

(D-Detroit) invited them to Lansing to let his fellow legislators see what can be accomplished with the special education money the legislature appropriates this year.

A DOZEN students from the Josephine Brighton Work Skills Development Center in Ecorse went to Lansing with jewelry, games, stuffed ani-mals, neckties, tablecloths and decorations they make and sell at the center.

The students also served legislators samples of the cakes, cookies and bread they bake daily in the lunchroom they operate for the public.
All this is designed to show that the handicapped child, with proper in-

struction, can be a successful produc-

er and useful member of society. THE 85 CHILDREN at the center are classed as "trainable mentally impaired," normally considered below the employment level.

But these students, in their handicraft and lunch programs along with some industrial assembly work done on a contract basis, have produced more than \$15,000 in sales in this school year.

The proceeds of their work is used to buy equipment for the center and provide field trips for all of the stu-

The display was arranged by Dr. William Simmons, superintendent of the Wayne County Intermediate School District, at the request of Ryan and Rep. George Montgomery, chairman of the House Taxation Committee and longtime member of the education committee.

The Brighton center is one of eight special education centers operated by the intermediate district at the request of local Wayne County school districts for their own special education students.

"I think it is important that legislators have a chance to see what results can be obtained with the money they vote each year for special education,' said Ryan.

THE LEGISLATURE is currently working on the school aid bill for 1974-75 which may provide additional funds for the trainables and all other handicapped children.

There are 170,000 Michigan children - physically, mentally or emotionally disturbed - who are helped each year by \$84 million allocated by the legislature to local school districts for special education.

"We are proud to be able to have the legislature see what these students can do," says Simmons, "and prove that the child once considered a castoff can take his place in the working world."

Williams urges trimming defense budget

Theo Williams, who is seeking the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 2nd District, called for reduced defense department expenditures while speaking recently to a group of voters in Huron High School, Ann Arbor.

Williams noted the possibility of saving up to \$25 billion in the defense budget by intelligent use of procurement procedures in new weapons systems for the armed forces.

He noted that even Sen. Barry Goldwater had stated as much as \$8 billion could be saved if the nation's tactical air forces were truly unified, noting that cost was now about \$13 billion but could be \$5 billion with unifica-

WILLIAMS EMPHASIZEDa his points by noting he was formerly a project engineer in government products work with General Electric Co. and that after some \$3 million had been spent on a certain project they were told it wasn't really needed that the government just wanted to see if it could be done.

Williams, an Ypsilanti resident, is running in the district which includes Livonia, Plymouth, parts of Washtenaw County and Monroe County.

Williams also discussed right of privacy, calling attention to the Senate constitutional rights subcommittee's report on information storage banks and the several hundred computers now in use.

He pointed to misuse of the data bank computer in Lennexa, Kan., in which more than 30 persons were subjected to discrimination before the practice was stopped, and how the Lennexa police chief had supposedly been disciplined but with the chief himself saving he hadn't been disciplined.

WILLIAMS NOTED it was against police regulations to misuse computer bank information, but apparently not against the law.

"All of this clearly doesn't help the average citizen who may never even find out that false data was used to refuse employment, not to mention the chilling aspects of blackmail under such conditions, without adequate control."

On false information in data banks, Williams cited how a person in a western state was falsely listed in FBI files for 30 years as a fugitive from justice. He noted a case only this year, on April 24, where a federal judge stated that if a person was listed as arrested in FBI files, those files must be expunged if the person is later exeronated.
SECRET SCHOOL records can also

hurt students, Williams also noted. There is a need for better coordination between teachers and parents in the matter of school records and a need for teachers to explain the records if necessary, he added.

Williams made a special point of the "spin numbers" that had hurt several hundred thousand honorably discharged veterans. He noted how one Navy veteran with outstanding awards for meritorius service was given a bad "spin number" on his discharge, causing him a lot of trouble getting employment.

This was all because his spin number listed him as an agitator, Williams adds, simply because he passed a letter around in Vietnam advocating that the war should be stopped. This abuse has recently been stopped, he adds, by Rep. Edward Hebert, chairman of the House Armed Services Committee.-

Williams said some police departments had "pre-delinquent files," even though there is yet no definition of just exactly what that term means. The implication seems clearly obvious though, says Williams, and "certainly no good parent would ever want their child's name to ever be in such a

has urged state adoption of proposed legislation to remove the criminal stigma from public intoxication.

Thursday, June 13, 1974

The legislation, Substitute House Bill 4008, would remove public intoxication as a criminal offense and instead treat alcoholism as a disease. The proposed "Substance Abuse Service Act" is patterned after model federal legislation adopted by Congress in 1970, and would make Michigan eligible for federal funds for alcoholism treatment programs.

COMMISSIONER George F. Killeen (D-Detroit), who represented commissioners a hearing on the bill in Lansing last month, told a subcommittee of the House Judiciary Committee that such legislation is "long over-

Police or emergency service patrols established under the act could take a publicly intoxicated person to a detoxificatiion center or approved medical facility for treatment.

Killeen said: "Humane treatment of public intoxication now prevails in 17 other states. It is generally recognized that alcoholism is a disease and public intoxication is one of its symptoms."

The bill is also supported by the Substance Abuse Services Advisory Council in Wayne County.

THE BOARD of commissioners resolution declares that "continued incarceration of persons for simple drunkenness who have not been involved in any other unlawful activity, is a disservice to the people themselves and an unnecessary and improper burden on law enforcement agencies including the police and the

The proposed legislation reflects the views of the American Medical Association, the National Council on Alcoholism. Alcoholics Anonymous, the National Institute of Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism New Detroit and the Michigan State Bar Association.

There are about 150,000 alcoholics in Wayne County compared with 50,000 abusers of other drugs.

GENERAL EDUCATION examinations will be given in English composition, humanities, mathematics, natural science, and social science-

Students may elect to take all five general education exams, or any combination, for six semester hours credit

Other students will be writing examinations in any of 35 specific subjects such as accounting, elementary computer programming, American literature, chemistry or geology, for four credits each.

College Level Examinations are among the newly accepted methods of earning college degrees and provides adults entering post-secondary education a chance to prove that acquired knowledge is equal to taught knowl-

Among Madonna's more notable CLEP-testers is Norma Gleason from Lapeer who has accumulated 32 hours of credit through CLEP and has spent only a few hours on campus.

NEITHER IS THE recent high school graduate excluded from CLEP

Last September, five members of the incoming freshman class had acquired from 12 to 24 credits before attending a single class. (The tests are designed and controlled by the College Level Examination Board of Princeton, N.J.)

Madonna is one of 16 college locations in Michigan where CLEP tests are given. Madonna and another 28 Michigan colleges accept CLEP credit, as do many colleges throughout the

If students are more than 100 miles from a test center, arrangements can be made for testing at a convenient location. Testing can also be arranged. in military bases' overseas or in foreign countries.

CLEP TESTING isn't the only nontraditional method of earning credit

Students may "challenge" the material in any course by writing a departmental examination. They may also have their "life experiences" evaluated by a professor and the dean, take individual study with a professor, watch a TV course, or study an approved newspaper course. They also serve internships and create individual projects.

Such "external" means of gaining education are becoming more common, although Madonna is regionally a front-runner in the trend.

Two colleges have recently been created to grant degrees only for such programs. One is a university of the State of New York Board of Regents, and the other has been established by the New Jersey Department of Educa-

pupil aid

Marj Lansing, candidate for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 2nd District, attacked the Nixon administration's proposed 1975 education budget and urged cuts in military spending to finance expanded loan and work-study programs for college

Speaking to students at Washtenaw Community College, Mrs. Lansing said Nixon's cuts in student aid have worsened the financial crisis for institutions and blocked opportunities for students who cannot afford college expenses of between \$1,850 and \$4,000 each year.

"His 1975 budget request provides no funds for the supplemental educational opportunity grant program or the national direct student loan fund and includes only \$250 million for the work-study program," she said.

"The proposed budget ignores current law which requires all three programs be funded at a minimum total of \$653 million before any money is allocated to the new Basic Opportunity Grant (BOG) program.

"The BOG program is to include \$1.3 billion in 1975 — a figure I consider completely inadequate to ensure educational opportunities for all Americans. I urge Congress to double the allocation.'

The 2nd District has more full time college students than any other district in the nation, Mrs. Lansing pointed out. "Higher education is a major industry here. Inadequate federal support not only limits opportunities for students, but threatens jobs and frustrates efforts of colleges and universities to meet pressing needs to revitalize programs."



Rosenbergs' relatives remember

quarter century ago. Their youngest son, Robert Meeropol-Rosenberg, who was six years old at the time of the trial. spoke on behalf of his parents at the Jewish Community Center on

The talk, sponsored by the Jewish Parents Institute, drew a crowd of 400, according to Beverly Gould, chairman of the JPI instruction committeed in charge of

adult education. The Rosenberg's two sons, Robert and Michael, believe there are lingering doubts about the guilt of their parents, the government prosecution tactics and the ultimate penalty. They are determined to reopen the case, an action they consider "of great political importance in post Watergate America.'

"The Watergate revelations with charges of high-level criminal conspiracies, cover-ups and perjury in the name of national security, strengthens our contention that our parents were victims of a government frame-up to feed anti-Communist hysteria in the cold war."

ROSENBERG AND his brother believe continuing doubts about the case are strong enough for a commission investigation. They have read and dissected everything written about the events

The brothers have filed a lawsuit in 1953 for conspiring to pass against Louis Nizer and his pubatomic secrets to the Soviet Union.

THE SONS MAINTAIN the trial and execution were politically motivated in the Senator Joseph McCarthy era of "a communist behind every bush."

Robert Rosenberg gave an audiovisual presentation last Sunday which was compiled with the cooperation of Boston University. It showed the background of the Rosenberg case and pointed out what the sons consider inconsistencies.

The Rosenbergs were executed


"We feel a strong responsibility to our parents," said Rosenberg who has been living in relative obscurity for 20 years. "We feel they are innocent and we believe the point has been reached where the facts must be revealed."

"We hope people will understand what we are trying to do goes beyond personal vindication. It is part of a larger process. It involves the violation of due process and civil rights in the name of na-

tional security."
In 1951, the Rosenbergs were pictured as arch-Communist traitors who by divulging the secret of the atomic bomb to the Russians helped start the Korean war.

the attorney who represented his parents was inept and the people who prosecuted the case were criminals "guilty of perjury and conspiracy to commit murder."







Great Lakes research lab is formed nearby

has formally established the Great Lakes Environmental Research Laboratory in Ann Arbor to bring together all the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Great Lakes researchers into one laboratory.

Scientists from the National Ocean Survey's Lake Survey Center in Detroit and researchers working on the International Field Year for the Greak Lakes (IFYGL) will work at the new laboratory which is the newest partner in NOAA's environmental research laboratories based in Boulder, Colo.

Announcement of the laboratory was made recently by Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) whose 2nd District includes Livonia and Plymouth.

DR. EUGENE AUBERT, IFYGLproject officer director, will head the new laboratory. Esch takes credit for Ann Arbor

being picked as the site for the lab. Two other locations in Ohio and another in Detroit had been considered ear-According to a spokesman for Aubert's office, two buildings at 2300

Washtenaw Avenue in Ann Arbor will be leased from the Thetford Corporation to house the Great Lakes Experimental Research Laboratory. "Announcement of the formal establishment of this very important facility is the culmination of nearly a year's effort on my part in con-

"Certainly Ann Arbor is the logical choice for the location choice because of heavy concentration on on-going

Michigan and private industry," says

Great Lakes research programs. "This formal establishment of the laboratory in Ann Arbor is indeed welcome news for our region and Michigan, not only for the jobs it will bring

The U.S. Department of Commerce help provide intelligent planning and problem solving."

Esch said he was informed that scientists will begin moving into the facility late this summer. Some 30 scientists will investigate the total lake ecology from the sediments below the water to the air above.

ACCORDING TO a commerce department statement, Aubert will coordinate the lab agenda which for the first few years will focus on the IFYGL project.

IFYGL is a joint effort between the U.S. and Canada to collect, analyze and manage massive amounts of data on one of the lakes shared by both nations - Lake Ontario.

Some 600 U.S. and Canadian scientists and technicians began collecting reams of data about Lake Ontario in April 1972. The job of analyzing that data will occupy the team until 1977.

Aubert estimates that for the next couple years, two-thirds to threefourths of the efforts will be occupied with this project.

For the longer range programs, NOAA has mapped out some projects and goals, such as improving navigation, preventing erosion or pollution, or predicting changes in lake water

A primary goal will be a comprehensive model of lake circulation - how the water circulates in response to the natural forces acting upon it. A hierarchy of models would be developed to include every conceivable facet, such as wind stress, differential heating and cooling, inflow of water from tributaries, seasons, and the shape of the lake.







A unit was sent to 167 Union St., a block from police headquarters, where Mrs. Williams was found lying on the kitchen floor in a pool of blood. A broken glass pitcher was found near the body.

Williams was discovered sitting on the living room floor, his left wrist bleeding from apparent self-inflected cuts by a razor blade.

Williams was taken to Wayne County General Hospital and arraigned in the hospital the following day by Judge Davis.

Mrs. Williams was pronounced dead at the scene by a doctor who was called by police.

Pretrial examination of Williams will be resumed at a later date.







WSU introduces Stratford plays

The College of Lifelong Learning, Wayne State University, is sponsoring a series of introductory lectures to three plays selected from the 1974 Stratford Ontario Festival program.

Called "Three for Stratford '74," the lectures will be on three consecutive Tuesdays at 8 p.m. in the Grosse Pointe War Memorial, 32 Lake Shore, Grosse Pointe and will begin June 25.

The lectures, to be given by Dr. Philip J. Traci, Wayne State University Associate Professor of English, will focus on two Shakespearean plays : "Love's Labour's Lost" on June 25,

and "King John" on July 9, and on Moliere's "The Imaginary Invalid" on

Professor Traci, author of articles

on Christopher Marlowe, John Donne and Shakespeare, and of a book on "Antony and Cleopatra," teaches graduate and undergraduate Shakespeare courses at WSU. This summer, he will be conductiong a graduate seminar of the text, sources, stage history and

criticism of "King John." The program was designed to give interested parties a greater enjoyment of the plays through a richer knowledge of the written works and their authors.

On Saturday, June 22, individual shooters compete with their antique weapons. Several times each day, the din from the antique weaponry dies down and the air clears of the blue smoke and the acrid aroma of black powder for a series of special activities. In one of these, the unique First Bri-

gade Band of Milwaukee performs martial music from the Civil War. Using arrangements of 100 years ago or more, they play stirring marches from the past on authentic antique in-

Once each day, there is a special 'All Star" musket team competition between the midwest and northwest teams of the North-Souskirmish Association.

Later, a Civil War cannon and an authentic Gatling gun take to the field as expert teams demonstrate the loading and firing techniques of these relics from America's past.

Near the viewing stand, a group of skilled craftsmen demonstrate the arts essential to the frontiersmen or soldier and his weapons.

There is a gunsmith, a powder horn carver, a bullet molder and a knife maker. A few steps away, Village officials are busy judging the com-petitors' costumes for prizes which are awarded on the field.

A colorful parade of the competitors, field equipment and three

For the fifth consecutive summer. programs has gathered together a talented group of young professionals and formed a resident repertory company at the U-M Ann Arbor campus.

This year, Michigan Repertory '74 will present three warm-weather diversions: Shakespeare's rousing comedy, "The Taming of the Shrew," William Inge's balmy romance, "Picnic," and the dazzling musical comedy spoof, "The Boyfriend." Classic, modern and musical, the three plays present diverse approaches to the

warmest of summer subjects-l'amour.

In the wake of the feminist movement, the battle of the sexes has become a topic of focus recently. Seldom is the question dealt with as poetically or delightfully as in Shakespeare's classic, "The Taming of the Shrew."

Petruchio's stormy wooing of the strong-willed Katherina is hardly his winning of her—a process which takes considerable more cunning and energy. The comedy's tentative conclusion reveals Shakespeare's delight that the difference between man and woman is eternal and insurmountable. Romance assumes a much gentler guise in William Inge's "Picnic." A freight train brings a young vagabond to a small Kansas town-like a thundershower to interrupt the stifling tedium of July-and his unsettling presence disrupts the lives of the townsfolk.

Inge constructs his characters with fondness: the hypocritical stalwarts, the mischievous adolescents, and the young people intrigued and confused by their first encounter with passion.


Passion takes a turn for the funnier in Sandy Wilson's "The Boyfriend." In this up-beat musical mockery, the theme of "boy meets girl" is presented at its sappiest. Dazzling spectacle, improbable rendezvous, and considerable hilarity capture the mood of the 1920s English musical revue in a frolic which all ages can enjoy.



Unlicensed kids, doting parents spell trouble

It seems that each spring brings out a new problem for area police departments to resolve, and one of the peskiest this year is trying to control the gatherings of minibike and motorcycle riders who seem to be making life unbearable for homeowners in many districts.

This isn't to mean the men in blue are bothered with major problems by adult motorcyclists, who know what they are doing, where they are going and have the necessary drivers' licenses to move around.

The problems are coming from those 16 and under who lack the required driver's license and who have no intention in the world of staying within the limits of the laws.

These are the ones who have caused floods of complaints about noise and reckless riding to the various police departments and almost have the officers at a point where they would like to join hands and rid the streets and highways of all of the motorcycles and minibikes driven by juve-

niles without licenses. It is a well known fact that a youngster can't secure a driver's permit until he has become 16 years of age and then after taking lessons and passing a rigid test.

ALL OF WHICH makes one wonder just what parents are thinking about when they purchase a motorcycle or minibike for youngsters under 16 and then look the other way as they roam the streets, endangering the lives of many and really disturbing the peace and quiet of neighborhoods with excessive noise.

Many of these youngsters - and mind you, we are not saying all - forget all about safety after awhile and scoot around residential areas at high rates of speed, as high as the vehicle will go, and practically dare residents or police to stop them.

That's when the complaints pour into the police stations everywhere in the area from Rochester to Westland and from Redford Township west through Plymouth, and that's when the police try to stop such shennanigans.

However, as two or three police chiefs pointed out when asked about the situation, it is rather difficult to catch a youngster on a motorcycle that can roar through back yards and onto the next street while police officers have to drive around the block in automobiles.

It is frustrating incidents like this that cause officers to "lose their cool" sometimes, and then residents forget their complaints about the noise and charge police brutality. So it's often a case where you can't win for trying and, more often than not, lose.

THE SITUATION became so bad in Redford Township that Police Chief Edwin Gleza ordered two trail bikes put into service handled by two members of the force who are experienced riders

and also have the ability to communicate with the youngsters.

Most police chiefs believe in placing the blame where it belongs, and in this instance they place it on the shoulders of doting parents who want their sons to have anything the kid down the street has.

"Seems strange," says a spokesman for the police bosses. "These parents have strong respect for the laws in everything else but forget all about laws, violations and most anything else when they buy their youngster a minibike or a motorcycle.

They know perfectly well that state law prohibits a youngster without a driver's license from riding the vehicle anywhere else but on their property. Parents know once their boy starts down the street on the bike, he is in violation of the laws and liable for arrest, but still they just laugh, point out how well Junior is riding and look the

"But imagine how they scream when they receive a call from the police station telling them the boy has been taken into custody and his bike placed in the pound for driving on public thoroughfares with a driver's permit.

"They rush to the station, yell about discrimination, threaten to take it to the highest court in the land ... just imagine, their son having apolice record at the age of 13! ... But rarely do they admit that perhaps they erred in allowing the boy to violate the laws.

"THAT'S WHAT WE have to face almost every time we make an arrest. Parents forget it's the job of police officers to enforce the law and to keep the peace. They would like to have you believe their case if different from others and they should special treatment.

"That's why we of the police departments place the blame on the parents. If they would wait until their boy has a driver's license, then there wouldn't be any trouble. Or if they must buy a minibike or a motorcycle, then they should make certain the boy is riding it only on their property and not in a dangerous or noisy manner.

"If parents would do that - and we know they won't - then the work of the police officers would be much easier in the spring and summer. Perhaps the tempers of parents would be at a much lower level also. So we would all have a more enjoyable time when the weather is the best."

Thank heavens for the police chiefs and their men who try to resolve this major problem and maybe, just maybe, the message will get home to some of the parents.

Newsprint price zooms Expensive garbage wrap

Living with double-digit inflation can have some unexpected social consequences these days. For example, consider newspaper scavenging. A couple of weeks ago, we ran a story about the problems they're having in Birmingham, where there is a city newspaper recycling pro-

gram. Last year, newsprint recycling plants paid \$10 per ton for old newspapers. But with today's inflation, the price has jumped to \$30 per ton.

As the price has risen, so has newspaper scavenging. People are driving around Birmingham in anything from compact cars to old vans to

gleaming Cadillacs, swiping bundled newspapers left at curbside for the city's collection service.

This practice, together with increased competition in the old newspapers field from civic and charitable groups, has cut the tonnage going through the city's recycling plant.

NEWSPRINT, once regarded as almost a "free good," has become a valuable commodity.

Recycling plants generally ask few questions if someone drives up with a pickup truck loaded down with bundles of old newspapers. And if you figure that you can get around a half-ton into the back of a station wagon, scavenging can bring \$15 per load ... today.

Tomorrow it could be more, since the price of newsprint keeps going up.

For example, last December the newsprint on which we print this paper cost us \$175 per ton. Since then, it has jumped in price to \$213 per ton, and just last week we received telegrams from our newsprint suppliers informing us that the new price as of July 1 would be \$235 per ton.

A 34 per cent increase in a little over a year

and a half is pretty steep.

And last month, a newsprint industry spokesman shocked an audience of publishers by remarking that, at today's interest rates and costs of new papermaking machinery, newsprint would have to cost \$288 per ton before it became economically sound for paper companies to buy new equipment.

SUCH PRICES translate into some pretty startling numbers per newspaper. The paper you are now reading averages in weight between 10.5 and 17 ounces, depending on

the edition and the season of the year. If newsprint today costs \$213 a ton, that's 10.65 cents per pound, or .666 cents per ounce. So the cost of the paper you are reading now - just

in newsprint - ranges from 6.99 to 11.32 cents. All this goes to show that what newspaper publishers used to say about their paper -- that it was valuable for wrapping garbage after being read - now applies in many, many more ways in these days of inflation.

The new danger spots: Our local public parks

Concerned parents are afraid to allow their children to go to the parks, especially after dark, Even though there are groups, the majority, looking for harmless fun, for singing around a fire, roasting marshmallows and just rapping together, others enjoy looking for and causing trouble.

In the "good old days" there was a park officer who would occasionally pass through the groups just to make certain everything was all right.

The Wayne County Sheriff Department's two helicopters constantly patrol parks in an effort to prevent trouble.

The Redford police, Livonia, Westland, Garden City, Plymouth police are kept busy patroling the parks, investigating large groups that gather after dark.

Drug raids are not uncommon. Valuable man hours are spent by undercover agents who patrol the parks seeking out drug pushers and users. In many instances, they find them.

Police agencies urge parents to keep a closer watch on where their children are at night. Too

often this plea falls on deaf ears. Redford police report parents often drop their

children off at parks in early evening, not knowing who they are with or what they are doing. In one instance, a man drove his young daughter to Bell Creek Park saying he would "pick her up around 11 p.m." He was afraid to go into the park himself.

It isn't just older groups that gather in the parks and cause trouble. One department reported its undercover agents arrested a 15-year-old girl who was selling marijuana. When caught, she complained that she had only made "\$90 tonight while last night I made \$150."

MOTORCYCLE GANGS are causing problems in the parks, too.

Redford has purchased two cycles which will be used to better patrol the parks.

As one police chief said, "We will just have to move in and break up these rowdy groups as we have had to do each year. Once they learn we mean business, they move off, usually to another park."

Police say many troublemakers are not from locl areas. Word gets around that a certain park is a good gathering place for pushers and users. Until broken up, gangs use the spot for a "market place" for those who prey on gullible youths.

Police say if only parents would make it a point to know where their children are and with whom they associate, a lot of the park trouble would be

Our parks could be fun places, safe places again if only everyone would just care a little.

Coatings symposia topic

The Society of Manufacturing Engineers will sponsor a three day symposia on "Powder Coatings" and "Electrodeposition of Coatings" in the Polymer Institute, University of Detroit, June 10-12 and June 13-15 respectively.

The June 10-12 symposium and laboratory, "Powder Coatings," will cover equipment and techniques used in coating metal parts including automo-bile bodies. Different types of polymeric coatings will be demonstrated and discussed as well as such factors as the effects of humidity, particle size and type of support equipment.

J. M. DiVettorio, director of technical operations at Ransburg Corporation, Indianapolis, will be the symposium leader. The chairman will be Dr. Sidney L. Reegen, research professor of Polymer Science and Engineering and associate director of the Polymer Institute.





It's Fathers' Day all year in Y programs

For fathers everywhere, a special lay in the year comes Sunday, June

For some lucky and concerned dads in these parts, Fathers' Day comes a lot oftener. They are the ones who enjoy a year-round close companionship with their young sons and daughters through the Livonia Family Y Indian Guides and Indian Princesses pro-

gram. The fathers and sons in Indian Guides have a metto, "Pals Forever." Dads and daughters in the Princesses program are "Friends Always."

For all involved, it's seen as an opportunity for close companionship not being in January of 1973. to be missed in any family.

"IT'S PROGRAMMED TIME to spend with your son," explains Dave Lemon, current head of the Indian Guides. He and Brett, now 11, have been Indian Guides for four years and they are planning to go on-together-into the Y Adventurers program for older boys and dads.

They agree that of a variety of enjoyable activities, the camping trips are the best. "You have lots of fun and there's a lot of togetherness," says Brett.

THAT'S THE IMPORTANT part, for it means some counteracting of the national trend that sees many fathers spending longer and longer hours away from their growing children.

The Livonia Family Y brochure advertising the program states there are statistics showing "the shocking fact is that the average American dad spends about seven and a half minutes a week of close companionship

Lemon said that during his time with the Indian Guides he's been able to see real changes in relationships between fathers and sons.

"One boy and his dad literally hardly knew each other when they came in," he said, "but as they participated together with other fathers and sons in our meetings and outings a close-

ness began to grow.
"Both said later it was a good experience, and for me it was really great to watch this particular father and

THERE ARE 225 area families involved in the Livonia Family Y portion of a program that has been going on in YMCAs across the country for close to half a century.

It grew, appropriately, out of a conversation between a YW leader and an Ojibway Indian who told him:

"The Indian father raises his son. He teaches his son to hunt, to track, to fish, to walk softly and silently in the forest, to know all the meaning and purpose of life and all he must know, while the white man allows squaw to raise his son."

AS THE GUIDES program spread in the YMCAs, the idea gradually grew that white man was ready to go the Indian one better with realization that young daughters also need a closer relationship with fathers.

In the Livonia Family Y, that idea brought the Indian Princesses into

Dennis Yurk, father of four daughters, seemed the natural leader of such a group. He started with two daughters, and in recent months has had Allison, 9; Robin, 8; and Helene, 7; in the group, with four-year-old Suzanne waiting in the wings.

"We go camping together and on outings and have craft projects like making our ceremonial outfits," Yurk

Reliving one story of World War II heroism

Another one of those incredible World War II stories of courage and. stamina surfaced in Livonia and Westland recently with the visit of Mr. and Mrs. Wopke Kooistra of Holland.

They were in the area as house guests of their daughter, Mrs. Anneke Burke, who before her move to Mayville, lived in Southfield briefly and in Livonia for four years.

Speaking informally with several members of the Livonia Jewish Congregation, Mr. and Mrs. Kooistra told of a searing decision they faced during the German occupation of Hol-

they, the parents of three

young daughters, give shelter to eight Jewish strangers, who otherwise would probably meet death at the hands of the Nazis?

Deciding to protect the Jews, they took the eight into their small home in Utrecht not for a night or two, not for a week or two.

They kept them three years.

Mr. and Mrs. Wopke Kooistra will tell their story during services Friday, June 28 at 8 p.m. in the Livonia Jewish Congregation, 31840

as interpreter, Mr. Kooistra explained that "the room we gave them was about nine by nine."

"In it we put a father, a mother, and their 14-year-old son and their 18year-old daughter," he said. "We also had another father and mother and their 25-year-old daughter, plus one more man."

Mrs. Burke, who has heard the story many times before, explained that the room was devoid of furniture because that would have caused searching Germans to ask who slept

"Beneath the floor was a small area of concealment," continued Kooistra. "We dug it by carrying out

Speaking Dutch with his daughter one bucket of dirt each night so that we could dispose of it without arous-

ing suspicion."

"I don't remember knowing they were there in all that time," said Mrs. Burke, who was only four when the eight guests arrived. "For us children not to have been aware of them they had to be absolutely quiet all day. No coughing, sneezing, crying or

laughing." Kooistra said that "the only time we let our guests into the other part of the house was when the children were sleeping."

The eight Jews emerged then to wash, eat what little food there was available and talk. Mrs. Kooistra recalled that "one of the men was good at telling stories and imitating people, so that sometimes we were able to laugh a little."

To those who resort to martinis. pills or transcendental medititation because they feel themselves under stress, both Kooistras had something to say about tension.

"The Germans were always looking for able-bodied men to send away to their work camps," said Kooistra. "You might run, into a soldier any time."

"I was a weapons instructor in the Dutch underground and sometimes I carried around to other members of the organization pieces of the new Sten guns that the British were dropping to us," Koeistra said. One day, he said, he was spotted by

a German soldier who shouted, "Halt." Approaching Kooistra, he began searching him for weapons, slapping his chest and sides. "Luckily, I didn't have anything on

me that day," smiled Kooistra. The Germans searched their house three times, finding nothing. "A Dutch man pad joined the German when they first came because he thought they were something good," said Kooistra. "When he realized his mistake he got in touch with us and would let us know when the Germans were coming our way."

. But the tensions kept coming and in many forms.

@"One day a man appeared at our door saying he had escaped from Westerborg concentration camp in Holland," said Kooistra. "He looked" as though he had come from a camp. He smalled that way too. But I feared it might be a German trick.

"So I told him that I couldn't risk pregnant and was told by the doctor keeping him because of the danger to my family. "But since he only wanted "But to find food she had to travel to stay one night I took him to a neighbor and asked him to keep him and he did. He left the next day and we never heard of him again."

But after the war Kooistra had a conference with his neighbor. "The man told me that he and his

wife were in tears all night for fear of what might happen to them because they took in this man," he said. "But when he and his wife learned that we had eight Jews for three years, he

just couldn't believe how we did it." Mrs. Kooistra also had her share of stressing problems. "My mother was

to rest and relax," said Mrs. Burke. around the countryside on a bicycle without tires. One day she fell off, but when my brother was born he was the fattest one of us all."

But the terrible stress took its toll, strangely enough 10 years after the end of the war. Kooistra had a severe nervous breakdown.

"It was terrible to see him then," said his daughter. "He seemed nothing but skin and bones."

While not recalling an awareness of their dangerous guests during those Continued on Page 28

loved children," she said. "And hearing us play every day outside her door, she longed to hug or hold one of

Her chance came on the eve of St. Nicholas, the Dutch equivalent to Christmas.

"For the holiday celebration, my parents arranged to have her face blackened and have her hand out the presents," Mrs. Burke said. "She was able to hug us a little

while she was doing this," she continued. "But then she started to cry, so that what I remember about it was seeing all the blacking begin to run down her face."

She added: "We never tried to get into our extra room because my father told us it was his work room and very dirty. He also warned us he would spank us if we did."

Her mother used to hang the clothes of the eight on the line, she said, "and when one of our neighbors commented on their number, my mother told her she did laundry for her sis-

"Food was very scarce," said Mrs. Burke. "The people living with us were able to give us about 150 guilders a week per person and that was our only support. But a pound of butter cost 100 guilders."

Then the war ended "My parents find it hard to express in words their feelings about the moment when the eight people were finally freed," she said. "You must remember they had not set foot outside the house for three years. It was an

Women on the Go

Mary Lodge boosts AAUW image

A Livonia lady with a bent to matters governmental is playing a big role in giving the American Association of University Women an action

Mrs. Mary Lodge, long active in the Plymouth branch of the AAUW and in recent years a founding member of the Livonia branch, is Michigan legislative chairman for the organization.

In this capacity she helps branches around the state determine how they can be most effective in bringing about legislative changes they favor.

"I THINK THE AAUW has been thought of mainly as a study organization that is likely to leave the action to other groups," Mrs. Lodge said.
"But we have a long history of tak-

ing a stand on many issues before legislative bodies. Now we are learning better how and when to take more action, and we are finding out we can be more effective if we work with other organizations such as the League of Women Voters and Common Cause."

RECENTLY MRS. LODGE partici-

pated in a one-day workshop for AAUW state and branch legislative chairmen from five states, Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Illinois and Wisconsin. One of the topics under consideration at the workshop was possible

political campaign financing. "I was asked to talk about techniques of organizing action in a matter like this," she said.

AAUW action in the area of reform in

"Things like how do you go about writing to legislators, what sort of letters to write to newspapers, how to conduct a telephone campaign.

"We have a detailed AAUW tool catalog with just such information and I used it for my presentation."

SHE ALSO WENT into specifics on AAUW policies for taking a stand on legislative matters.

'Any decision by a state organization must be compatible with our national organization's stand." Mrs. Lodge said, "and if a local branch wants to take action it must be in line with the state position.

"Of course, action might be taken with the rest of the stated position." on an issue that's strictly state or local, but it still must be compatible

THUS, SHE SAID, the AAUW's na-

spring adopted standards for campaign financing reform, including public financing of federal elections, limiting candidates' expenditures, making provisions for political party contributions, establishing acceptable tax sources for financing campaigns and setting up an independent election commission with enforcing power.

The position paper then prepared by the Michigan legislative committee followed along these points and also urged full disclosure of campaign income and expenses.

MARY LODGE takes a pragmatic, view of action to accomblish legislative change.

She's glad to see her AAUW joining forces with other groubs and is sure there's a better chance of success if there is cooperation, for instance, with Common Cause, "which retains

a representative in the capital." "And it's my own feeling that a petition drive may eventually be the means of getting action on this issue. We would all have to work on that."

THIS LEGISLATIVE chairman wouldn't be at all displeased to to see the AAUW in Michigan follow the example of the Washington state organization which participated in an initiative that has brought the state a stringent public disclosure law.

The law went before the Washington Supreme Court, with the AAUW named as a defendant, and it was up-

Following that ruling, there came a comment from Marianne Craft Norton, the AAUW leader involved.

"We have lost our innocence," she declared. "It is not enough to make an idealistic stand and wait for events to fall into-place. We must be determined and committed enough to make things happen—to work the democratic system every step of the way, contributing resources of time, energy and money.

"Vigilance and persistence are imperative to the success of public inter-




He has served two other parishes, St. Mark of Warren and St. Martin of

Dad's still model for little boy

more time with his mother, but it's his father's behavior that seems to shape the child's motivation and ability to learn.

The father who responds positively to his son's needs, praises his achievements and involves him in decision-making, is enhancing the boy's intellectual development, a University of Michigan study indicates.

The father may show this same kind of "nurturing" behavior toward his four-year-old daughter without affecting her learning ability at all. according to the study. For girls of this age, the mother's influence is domi-

nant. The study of 180 fathers and four-year-olds provides some important new information for behavioral scientists seeking & correlations between parental conduct and children's

learning, says Prof. Norma L. Radin of the U-M School of Social Work. It also offers a missing link in some of her earlier findings.

She had hypothesized that "a parent's 'nurturant' behavior-that is. warmth, responsiveness to the child's needs and feelings, the use of praise and reward, and inclusion in decision-making-would have a positive

impact on the child's learning ability. . "At first we studied preschoolers with their mothers. We found that in white families, a mother's nurturant behavior enhanced cognitive development in daughters but had no apparent effect on the learning processes for sons.

"Now we find the same pattern holding for fathers and sons. Apparently, Dr. Radin says, "four is an important age for sex role identi-

Each father was interviewed for about 90 minutes at home in the presence of his child. They were informed that the research was based not only

A four-year-old boy may spend on the questions they answered but on their behavior toward their child during the interview.

"During that length of time, the child is bound to get fidgety and make demands on the father---for food, attention or affection," Dr. Ann Epstein, research associate explains.

"We coded 26 kinds of father-child interaction such as meeting or ignoring the child's needs, engaging him in conversation, consulting, warning, threatening, bribing or correcting

"There were fathers who drew their sons into the conversation, answered their demands, asked their opinions and praised their response. Theirs were the sons who scored high on the standard achievement tests we administered later.

"Among fathers and daughters, expecially in middle class families, we observered a less positive behavior

pattern," Dr. Epstein continued. "The fathers would sometimes respond to their daughters' questions and demands and sometimes ignore them. They would alternate reasonable requests with unexplained orders or threats. These inconsistencies did not occur with fathers and sons.'

The researchers speculate that the daughters are receiving a "mixed message" from their fathers. The fathers display warmth, attentiveness and respect one minute and a lack of confidence or indifference the next. The contradictory nature of their behavior may be the reason they have no impact on the girls' cognitive de-

"Remember that we only studied fathers and children at the age of four," Dr. Radin stresses. "Our findings might be very different if the children were in elementary school or high school."

Although white families of lower,

working and middle class have been included in the latest study, Dr. Radin says that correlations between nurturance and cognitive development are much stronger in the white middle

The studies indicate that a variety of child-rearing patterns exist between fathers and mothers of different social classes, and these are still being evaluated.

At this point the U-M research team, which also includes research assistants Bonnie Jordan and Joan H. Eadie, have reached several general-

"First, the father's role in early child care has been largely neglected and underrated. The fathers we spoke to, representing a cross section of educational backgrounds and income groups, were very involved and interested in child rearing and were eager to talk about it.

"It's the quality, not quantity, of time that a parent spends with his child that's important," the U-M researchers emphasize. "There is something about nurturing behavior that makes a child feel good about himself, feel good about the world, and eager to master it."

The director of Michigan's Depart- are indefinite bans on unregistered dered non - camping visitors banned from campgrounds of 10 lower peninsula state parks and recreation areas

Results of field studies made last year by the DNR parks division also have prompted Director A. Gene Gazlay to order alcohol prohibited in all or part of five lower Michigan state parks and recreation areas.

No unregistered campers or other visitors will be allowed in the Bay City State Park campground, Bay County, from May 1 through June 15. This action is intended to stop noisy "joyriding" that in past years has disrupted early season campers.

From now through Labor Day, non camping visitors, will be barred from state park campgrounds at Lakeport (St. Clair County), Sleeper (Huron County), Hayes (Lenewee County), from the Metamora - Hadlley recreation area campgrounds Lapeer County and from Silver Lake State Park in Oceana County.



Varied tactics used by ghetto makers

The story is familiar: within a year after the Joneses, 'a black working class, family, moved to all-white Maple Street, a dozen nearby houses were sold to black families as well.

This is not integration; "the neighborhood is being converted from solidly white to solidly black, at great cost in human terms," says Prof. Jack Rothman of the University of Michigan School of Social Work.

"White prejudice is only the starting point. The less obvious, more purposeful influences are a core of real estate brokers and bankers who pro-

mote racism for profit. Their tactics vary in style and intensity among different communities, but they are widespread."

Rothman describes what he calls "the ghetto makers" in "Housing Urban America" a book published by Aldine Co. His article originally appeared in The Nation magazine.

"ONE METHOD is blockbusting. Through house to house canvassing, telephone calls, letters and other means, the realtors create an atmosphere of panic in the white neighborhoods. 'Do you want to be the last white family on the block?' goes the sales pitch. 'Do you want to lose a fortune on your house?'

"Occasionally a black woman is employed to wheel a baby carriage up and down the street to set the proper psychological climate. Black as well as white relators make use of blockbusting."

Meahwhile another group of brokers, the "lily-whiters," are operating in the adjacent, still-white neighborhoods, says Rothman. As a neighborhood becomes partially integrated, the "lily-white" brokers refuse to accept listings from that area or to show these homes to their white clients.

"THE REASONS may range from their own prejudices to realistic economic considerations: It takes more time and effort to place the average white buyer in an integrated area, and time is money.

"Banks and lending institutions play their unsavory part in this operation," Rothman explains. "They not only make it difficult for non-whites to obtain a mortgage in a white area, they discriminate against white families

"They reason that the white buyer will soon find himself part of a small minority and will consequently move soon, thus diminishing the duration of

wishing to settle in an integrated sec-

"The operational scheme of the ghetto makers thrives within the undemocratic and socially debilitating ground rules under which our racial minorities live. While blacks are choked for space in depressed slum areas, only a small fraction of new housing is being constructed to meet

their needs. "At the same time, their economic position continues to rise significantly and their attitudes are increasingly influenced by middle class values. It is no wonder that as a particular area of the city opens for non-white occu-

pancy, the black buyer will flow in that direction.

"THUS A NEWLY integrated community quickly becomes a solidly black community, with a solid assist from the ghetto makers.

"This pattern can be reversed only when American cities achieve an open occupancy status compatible with our democratic precepts. In addition to egislation dealing with discriminating in housing, the states need a fair selling practices clause which effectively regulates the blockbusters until a state of open occupancy is achieved.

"The blockbusters do not discriminate against blacks per se in the housing field," Rothman notes. "In fact they may be said to open up new living areas for them. But they do so by use of inflammatory selling practices and in such a way as to heighten racial tensions and create new racial ghettos.

"The ghetto makers exert power in America; they decide whom you can live next to and who can live next to you. For this they extract a huge prof-

John Carlo, the scrappy executive manager of Northville Downs, has an axe to grind against the recently passed Sunday racing bill which allows Sabbath programs at thoroughbred tracks but not at harness racing

Carlo, who in addition to being the boss at Northville Downs also is a lawyer even though he hasn't practiced for a long time, devoting all of his hours to harness racing, feels the amendment to the Michigan Racing Act of 1959 is unfair and discrimatory.

Which probably means that the Legislature may get pressure from the harness racing group to make a few changes that will allow harness racing on Sundays when the state's thoroughbred tracks aren't operating.

In his complaint, Carlo notes that the Legislature recently passed an act, Senate Bill 846, to amend Section 9 of the Public Acts of 1959, to permit and legalize Sunday racing for thoroughbred racing only with parimutuel betting.

HE CHARGES this is a very discriminating amendment. Under the circumstances existing in Detroit and in Michigan, the effect of the amendment is to assist the thoroughbred meetings and also help the standardbred meetings which are in operation at the same time.

And this, he states, affects only Hazel Park and Wolverine standardbred meetings which will race one night during the week without competition since the amendment provides the thoroughbred tracks can operate only six days a week including Sunday. Perhaps John is forgetting that his summer meeting operates at the same time as the Detroit Race Course and he'll have Mondays all alone for the four weeks.

Carlo charges the amendment is absolute discrimination against standardbred meetings in November, December, January, February and March. During these months when dates generally go to the harness tracks, the Michigan tracks can't race on Sundays and must compete with Windsor and Toledo which can.

HE POINTS OUT all that was necessary was to permit Sunday racing in Michigan by the pacers and trotters. on Sundays not assigned to the runners. And again he charges the amendment is an absolute injustice to Michigan harness horsemen who race during the winter months.

However, we feel we must mention that John's allegations are correct in some instances and not in others. The runners will be racing this year in November and most of December so there will be quite a few Mondays open to the standardbred tracks with no competition.

The other side of the picture and one that remains unanswered is where were the lobbyists for the harness tracks when the amendment was being discussed by both sides of the Legislature?"

Or perhaps it might be better to ask if the harness tracks have an active lobbyist in Lansing to protect their interests. If not, then it's about time the track managements smartened up and joined hands with the thoroughbred tracks to put up a common fight in Lansing. Little is done by looking on while others carry the fight and then riding on the coattails at the last minute. We're afraid that's a bit too late to get the job done properly.

It will be next Monday before Dorsey knowed defininte candidates for the state's richest stake. That's when he announces the weights. Even then horsemen may name additional starters by paying a \$5,000 fee.

Golden Don, surprise winner from heavily favored Tri Jet last year, is regarded as a likely starter since his owner is planning on shipping him from Chicago.

Others seen as probably starters are Kilfoil, already on the grounds, List, Crimson Falcon, Lone Bird and





It's rather difficult reporting on a tennis convention when the temperature is 85 degrees, the surf is pounding away, the sun is inviting everyone to turn into a bronze god or goddess but report I must on this, the sixth annual convention of the National Indoor Tennis Association.

The first convention drew 40 delegates representing about 30 clubs from across the country. This years' registration totaled 600 individuals representing 400 clubs from just about every state in the country, plus one gentleman from Tokyo, Japan. This is indicative of the phenomenal growth of the sport in the last decade.

The one thread that tied this group together was their optimism. I can't remember one pessimistic report or remark during the past three days pertaining to the future of the game. New facilities are still being planned, additions to present facilities are being pursued, more old line and new companies are entering the market in an attempt to capture a share of the profits generated by this supposedly simple sport.

I examined several new rackets manufactured by a company that formerly made skis. These rackets are priced to retail for (grit your teeth) \$175 and \$115. I did not endear myself to the salesman when I told him what I thought about his price. Yet he was taking orders for these rackets. Someone has faith in human nature. I guess we all know one person who would buy a racket at that price. It doesn't help his game any but it sure gives him something to talk about.

One of the more important functions of the N.I.T.A. is to survey their membership and find out something about you, the tennis player. I'm always a little skeptical about statistical re-

ports but the one presented to us was done by a Michigan State University faculty member, and we all know that only truth emanates from that wellknown bastion of learning.

In a survey of 1500 individuals conducted in two cities-a large metropolitan city and a medium size city of 200,000 population, several interesting facts were established. (The sampling consisted of non-players, those who played outdoors only, those who played indoors, and those who gave up the sport). About 30 per cent of the non-players were interested in learning to play, 46 per cent of this group were under 40 years of age.

One in three players never received information regarding indoor tennis. The major source of information came from advertising, 26 per cent and from friends, 34 per cent. Of the non-players, the questions was asked as to what sports they participated in, 38 per cent replied none.

Of those tennis players who played outdoors only, 63 per cent of them played on public courts. (We need more public courts). The reasons for joining indoor courts were: friends who join, exercise, proximity, and less expensive. The last was based on comparison of other sports spread

The average indoor club member plays over 60 times a year and spends over \$50 on equipment. Interestingly enough, 57 per cent of the club members found tennis very relaxing and only 9 per cent found it exhausting. While 7 per cent of non-players thought tennis was very relaxing and 41 per cent thought it would be ex-







The transition, halfway through the Congress, already is being considered and implemented by many industries in our country which will require the decade of lead time in which to retool from inches to millimeters.

As consumers, we'll have to learn to buy sugar and flour by kilograms (kilos for short) instead of pounds. Liquids will be dispensed in liters instead of pints and quarts, and car mileages will be expressed in kilometers per liter.
