## Victory gardening— Enjoying the fruits of your labors

CANTON—Residents of Canton Township have found out that you don't have to own an organic farm to eat healthfully and economically.

Rather, a garden plot provides a summer's worth of fresh vegetables, at a cost of a few hours a week of hoeing, watering and weeding.

In an effort to retain a bit of country living within a fast-growing community, the Canton recreation department has provided 320 garden plots for families or individuals interested in testing the abilities of their green thumbs.

Brenda Pollack, recreation director, explained that the idea came about in January when John Flodin, township clerk, heard about similar projects done in the Ann Arbor and Taylor communities.

Dick Lewiston, a developer and owner of the 20 acres located at Warren and Lilley Roads, gave the recreation department permission to use the

land for the gardens," Mrs. Pollack said.

"A farmer was hired to plow the field and the 25 by 50 foot plots were publicized on a first come first serve basis.

"In a few days, all 320 plots had been assigned free of charge," she said.

Before the gardeners began planting, Wayne County Cooperative Extension Services held a question and answer session on gardening problems.

"The session was very informative. Did you know that planting marigolds in between your vegetables keeps the animals away?" Mrs. Pollack asked.

With a resurgence of home grown vegetables and a new awareness of natural-organic foods, the garden plots are a blessing in disguise for most gardeners.

A quick look over the gardens reveals a large appetite for tomatoes, radishes, corn and the old-time favorite, watermelon, among the Canton crowd.

Mrs. Ruth Sweeney, 44260 Village Court, is taking advantage of the use of the plots and intends to can a few vegetables from her garden.

"I love fresh vegetables," Mrs. Sweeney said, "and gardening helps me get away from it all."

"I want to give my grandchildren a chance to eat fresh, right-from-the-garden vegetables."

"I don't think I'll save any money, but it's worth just smelling the freshness of the vegetables," she said.

Mrs. Cora Garascia, 6724 Burnham Drive, is extremely happy with the garden project.

Mrs. Garascia's garden is maintained with the help of her three-year-old daughter Lisa, who pays special attention to the watermelon plants.

"People should take advantage of this opportunity," Mrs. Garascia said. "It may help the grocery bill as well as get many people to enjoy the land."

"Most people use the excuse that they don't have time to keep a gar-

den, but if you enjoy it you'll find time," she said.

Debbie Pitera, 13, has a garden of her own filled with her favorites—predominately corn.

She doesn't intend to keep the vegetables of her labor all to herself though, but spread the good will among relatives.

What prompts a 13-year-old to maintain a garden when she could be out playing softball?

"It's fun. I'd like to work on a farm, only with machines, not by hand," Debbie said.

Debbie knows just when her plants need watering by checking pieces of clay in her backyard.

If the clay is dry, Debbie grabs the hose and recruits a friend to head for the garden and help her weed as well as water.

Overall, the residents regard the garden project as a big success.

"Out of 320 gardens, there were only three mix-ups," Mrs. Pollack said.

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## Year 'round school alternatives eyed

PLYMOUTH—The Plymouth Board of Education met in executive (secret) session Monday to discuss alter-

natives to the "45-15" year round school program.

The alternate plans released by the board, not in any order of preference are:

(A) To establish a small elementary school at East Middle School using six classrooms that have a capacity for approximately 100 students. The attendance area would include all the Miller area east of Lilley Road, which is about 130 pupils.

This plan excludes those students east of the expressway, who have previously transferred to Central Elementary School, and some 20 students in Plymouth Landing subdivision, located on the southeast corner of Warren and Sheldon roads.

Starting enrollment would be about 150 students in the new school at East and an initial enrollment at Miller of about 650 students. The Miller capacity would be allowed to grow to 690 pupils. Any incoming students beyond 690 would be placed in schools where open seats are available.

(B) Accomplish the "45-15" program by starting with three tracks in September. (This provides peculiar splits and arrangements for some tracks).

(C) Combine three middle schools, keeping Pioneer and Central because of their capacities as middle schools and establish either East or West, where enrollments could expand from 600 to 900 pupils. (The board said this plan creates considerable problems of logistics and expense to the district relative to furniture and time schedules for moving).

(D) Open Miller School as scheduled July 22, with willing teachers, new hires and or administrators available at that time. (The board said this idea risks an inevitable strike).

(E) Start anytime between July 22

and Sept. 3 that a contract settlement is reached.

The "45-15" program is scheduled to begin July 22. However, the Plymouth Education Association (PEA) has not reached a contract settlement for the 1974-75 school year.

On June 14 school officials were presented a petition signed by 22 teachers assigned to the first track at Miller indicating they would not teach unless a contract is ratified.

In a statement issued with the alternate plans, the board charged the PEA had earlier accepted plans for "45-15" as presented. They stipulated that teachers participating in the year round school program would be paid on a basis of the current contract with any adjustments made retroactive to the program.

On June 11 the "building representative at Miller School asked the board for a change in starting time of the "45-15" program."

The board's statement reads: "The board of education places as its first priority the settlement of an equitable contract consistent with the community's willingness and ability to pay. It feels that negotiations properly belong at the bargaining table and has expressed its willingness to meet at any time with the PEA."

School Supt. John M. Hoben said the board has requested a state mediator to preside over future negotiations and the PEA has agreed to it. Negotiations will resume July 8.

The board said it will continue "to seek settlements." However, it has spent "considerable time reviewing alternate plans to 45-15."

## Moceri files suit against Canton

CANTON—The controversial "Moceri Project" is not yet dead.

Dominic Moceri, the builder who proposed the regional shopping center for the southeast corner of Joy and Sheldon roads, has filed suit in Wayne County Circuit Court seeking to overturn the Canton Township board's veto of the rezoning needed for the project.

The suit, which seeks to have the board's April 9 action denying the rezoning overturned, claims that Moceri was denied "procedural due process of law" by the "emotional, vociferous and unwieldy (public hearings on the project) held in a circus or carnival-like atmosphere."

Filed by Plymouth Attorney Edward Draugelis, the suit further claims that the board's action "in voting against the proposed rezoning was totally arbitrary and capricious and was not based upon sound rezoning principles or upon the basis of public health, safety or general welfare of Canton Township."

Later in the suit, the board's action is described as being "based upon political pressure, whim and popular appeal."

Although the suit was filed June 28, warrants were not served on township officials until Tuesday.

Asked if the township would fight the suit, Township Clerk John Flodin said, "I'm sure we will."

## Towers project rescued again

PLYMOUTH — By a 4-2 vote Monday night, the Plymouth City Commission continued the city's participation in the Pilgrim Towers senior citizen housing proposal.

The vote, which followed lengthy debate on the matter, authorized the city to pick up the options on two parcels of the property assembled by the Pilgrim Towers group on Ann Arbor Trail near the C&O tracks.

Voting to exercise the option were Commissioners Norbert Battermann, Joe Bida, John Cummings and Harold Guenther. Mayor Beverly McAninch and Commissioner John Moehle voted against the resolution. Commissioner Robert Sincovick was on vacation.

City Manager Fred L. Yockey recommended that the city terminate its involvement in the project because "there are too many uncertainties and too much speculation to remain involved."

This is the third time the city has come to the rescue of the Pilgrim Towers group in picking up expiring options on parcels in the proposed site.

Last July the commission approved entering into a land contract to pick up four parcels on the site for \$65,690 and in December it picked up the option on another portion of the site for \$39,496.

The city has not had to pay the full amount but just the interest on the loans.

On Dec. 23 the principal on the first loan must be paid or the contract will be defaulted.

James Houk, executive director for the Pilgrim Towers Non-Profit Housing Corp. told the commission Monday that the city stands to lose no money on its participation in the project even if the group cannot obtain state or federal funding which it has been trying to get.

He described the two parcels the commission agreed to purchase Monday night as "the heart of the project" because of their location in the middle of the site.

Much of the discussion about continuing with the project centered around questions about the group's chances of obtaining state funding.

An attempt to get federal funding for the project has apparently failed.

Houk said five criteria must be met before state funding will be granted:

(1)The non-profit group must convert ownership to a limited dividend housing association (private corporation).

(2)Federal subsidies to the state must be made available — an uncertainty at this time.

(3)The proposed site must be enlarged. (Houk announced Monday night that the group was picking up an option on an adjacent parcel to be added to the site.)

(4)Further information about the non-profit group's qualifications had to be submitted to the state.

(5)The city commission, because of its participation in the project, must agree that it will turn over its parcels and agree to a tax abatement structure for the project.

Asked when the project could receive state funding approval, Houk said a state housing official said it could be Aug. 1. "But my past experience has been they don't always do what they say," Houk added.

The Pilgrim Towers director also said that should the project fall through lack of funding, the property would be sold and the city would be

reimbursed for its expenses and any remaining funds would be "returned to the city to spend as it sees fit for the elderly citizens of the community."

The commissioners discussed several questions about the project.

"This thing gets out of hand by our inability to follow it and get the facts we need," Guenther said.

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# These graduates are well-paid journeymen

At first, new apprentice students at Schoolcraft Community College may feel a little strange.

Originally they chose to go into a trade rather than attend college. They range in age from 18 through 44 and beyond.

Yet they are an important part of the college student body, rubbing elbows with green kids out of high school some of whom have never held a full time job in their lives, many the same ages as their own sons or daughters.

The college gives the apprentice programs for industries in conjunction with the U.S. Labor Department's Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training (BAT).

WHEN HE COMPLETES the required 42 hours of college courses and

8,000 hours of on-the-job training, the apprentice becomes a journeyman.

Because the apprentice makes about half the hourly rate of a journeyman, completion of the program not only puts the worker in line for promotions and increased responsibility, but it assures a sharp jump in income.

"Once a person has a journeyman's card," says Jerry Wale, program coordinator, "he'll make a minimum of \$10,000 a year, and I understand some go as high as \$45,000."

However, a lot of things have to happen before the journeyman classification is a reality.

Area BAT representative Tom Flynn checks both the company and the course program. If approval is granted, the apprentice signs a contract which refers to him as "an indentured apprentice."

He works a regular 40 hour week at his job and attends college class in addition to that. Flynn makes sure a student's on-the-job training is just that—a good, solid learning situation rather than repetitive labor.

MANY COMPANIES, particularly those with union shops, have a group which carefully supervises apprentice training. The group frequently made up of company and union representatives is called the Joint Apprenticeship Council (JAC).

The scope of JAC involvement varies from company to company. Some simply tell Wale they trust the college to provide the best program possible; others carefully screen each course offering.

Wale and his supervisor, Dean Ted Diebel, are well aware of how relevant courses must be.

As a result, 127 courses for apprentices are listed in the catalog and Wale tailors another 75 to fit individual needs.

Because some apprentices work nights and attend school days and the rest do just the opposite, courses must be offered twice, once during the day and again in the evenings, fall, spring and winter semesters.

WALE, A 1971 electrical engineering graduate of Lawrence Institute of Technology, has taken to the computer to unscramble the maze of offerings.

As an example of courses applying directly to the person's job, a carpentry apprentice will be taking classes in electrical building construction

and plumbing codes. He will also learn drafting, paint reading and some geometry.

Wale says, "The courses are written for people who are working full time. For instance, the algebra an apprentice might be taking is different from that offered by the math department. Anything not needed on the job is removed." He explains that courses are designed and taught by persons in industry.

Company size isn't a factor. Small industries as well as the major auto companies use the program.

The company pays book and tuition fees, and many will also pay the employee for his class time.

In return the employee is expected to show up for class, and the college feels an obligation to notify the company if an apprentice doesn't maintain regular attendance.

One metropolitan area company has a two year waiting list of employees who wish to take the exam to qualify for the "indentured apprentice" courses.

A VETERAN in the program would also qualify for VA benefits. For the first six months in college, a veteran with no dependents would receive \$160 per month in benefits. The following six months he would receive \$120 a month. Benefits decrease to \$80 in the third six months period and to \$40 per month in the fourth and remaining periods. The reduction in benefits is based on the premise that there will be salary increases as his training and skills build.

A veteran in school full time, but not in the program, receives \$220 per month.

Wale notes the average age of apprentices is going steadily downward. "The average is lower because trained people are no longer available. Companies simply can't find enough trained people."

EQUIPMENT in college labs may, in many cases, be the same as the apprentice works with in his regular job. The difference is that he will be learning new techniques and better ways of doing the job.

For instance in the welding lab, there are facilities for wire welding, heli-arc welding, electrical and arc

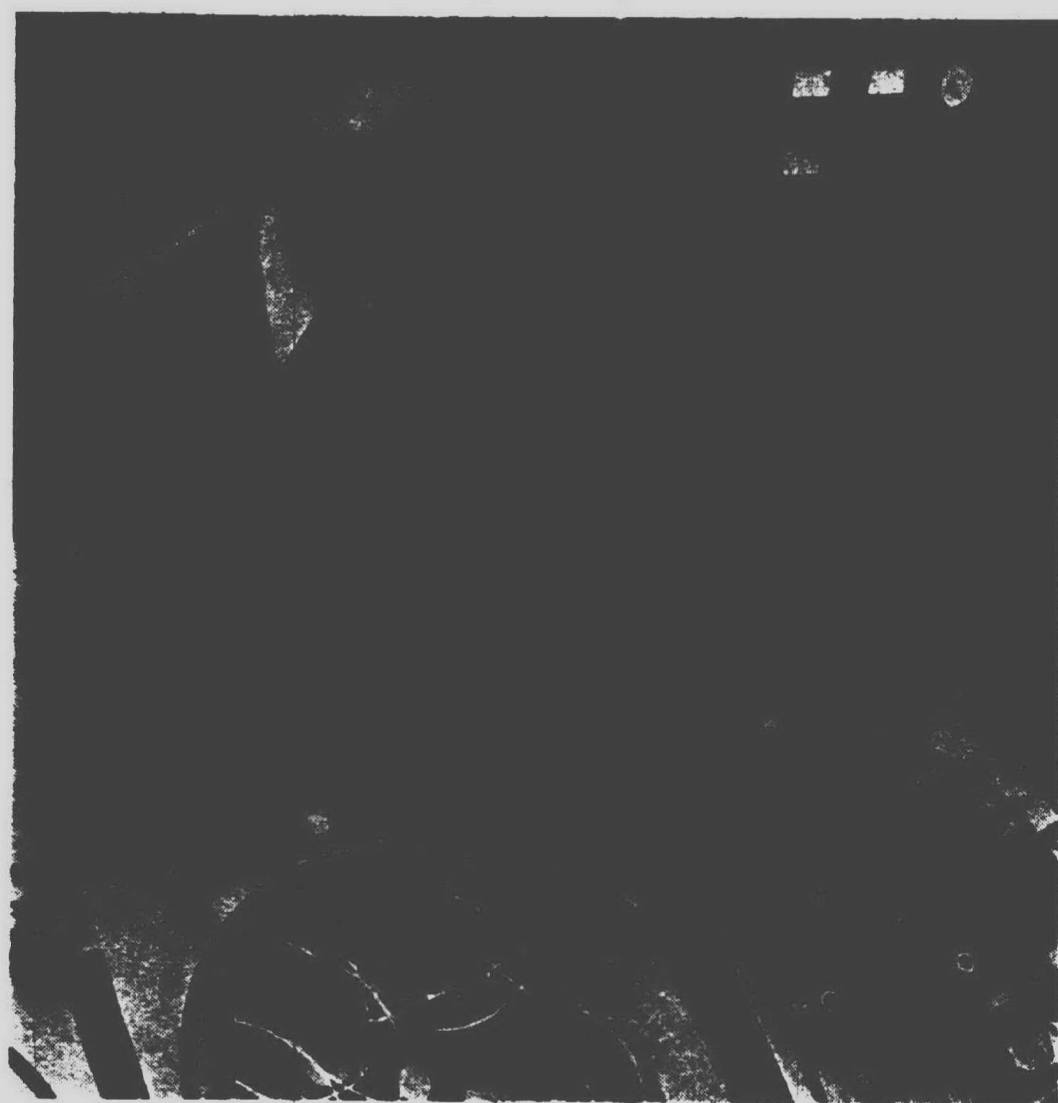
welding plus other methods such as the use of inert gas.

In the machine shop, students run tests and make repairs. Each will have an engine to strip and rebuild to running condition.

"For some reason," Wale says, "the machine shop has never caught on in the apprentice program."

But one that has which is relatively new is air conditioning and climate control.

Many of these courses are also being taken by EITs (employees in training). A company sends employees to the college, but the courses don't lead to a journeyman status and are not approved by BAT.

## Thunderbird open to Oct. 4 at least

PLYMOUTH—Rumors to the contrary, the Thunderbird Hilton Inn will continue operations under the present management through Oct. 4.

That was the statement of General Manager Arthur Kobierzynski to put an end to rumors that the longtime, popular eating place would close its doors on July 3.

"Although Investors Diversified Services Inc. did pick up the mortgage on April 3, there is a six months redemption period that ends on Oct. 4," said Kobierzynski. "We have no plans to change the operation in any way during that six months."


He stressed that the Thunderbird Hilton will honor all its commitments concerning parties, will serve lunches and dinners daily, Monday through Saturday, and continue all its services as in the past.

KOBIERZYNSKI DIDN'T have any comment about what will take place after Oct. 4.

"True enough that IDS did take over the mortgage obligations in April, but that doesn't mean we're going to close our doors now as many believe," he said.

"There are still three months remaining of the redemption period, and we will be in business as usual during that period."

The Thunderbird fell on sad times some 18 months ago when work was started on an ultra modern Hilton Motel-Thunderbird Inn complex. The frame of the new motel was constructed, and then the project became involved in financial difficulties which found work dropping to a standstill.



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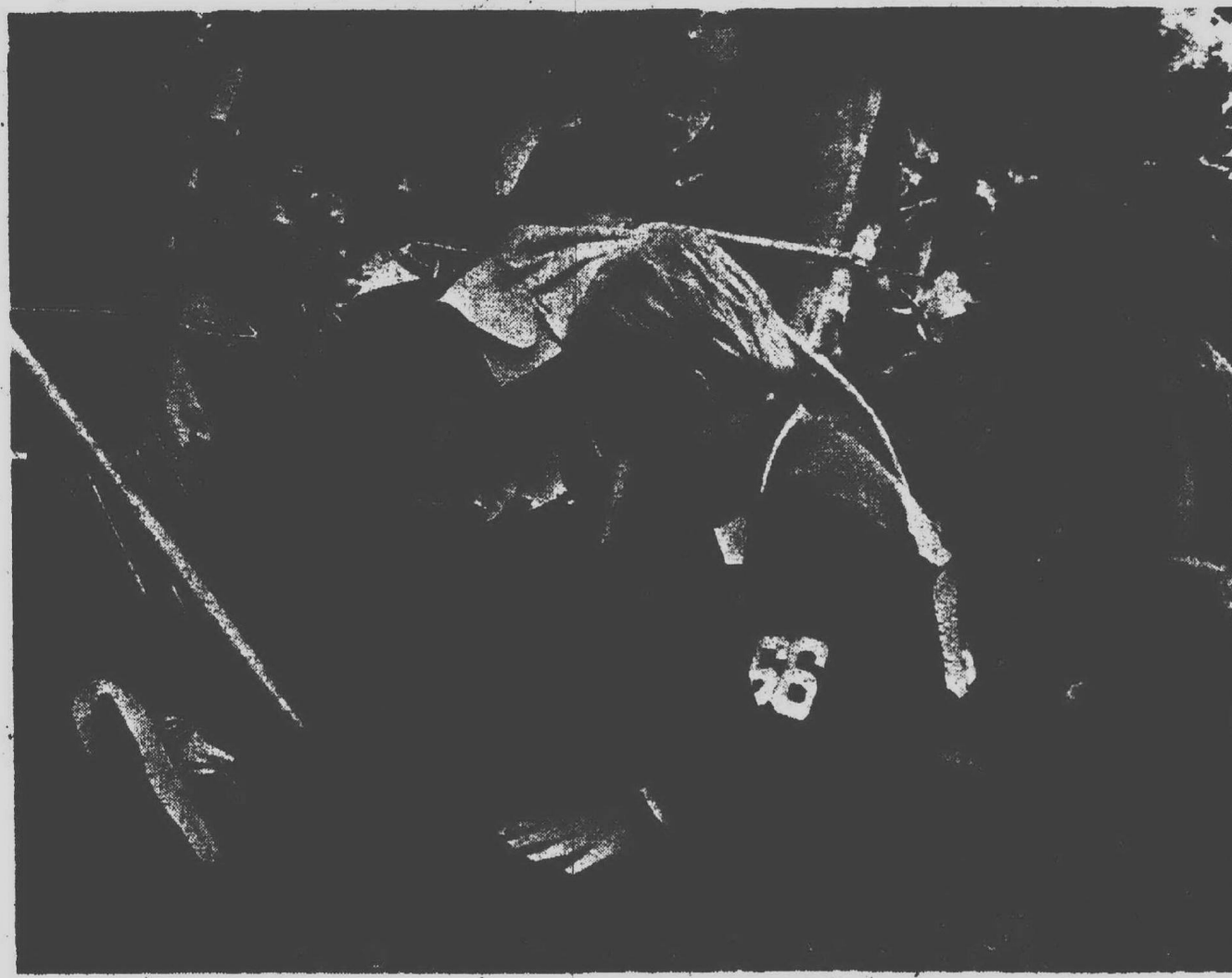
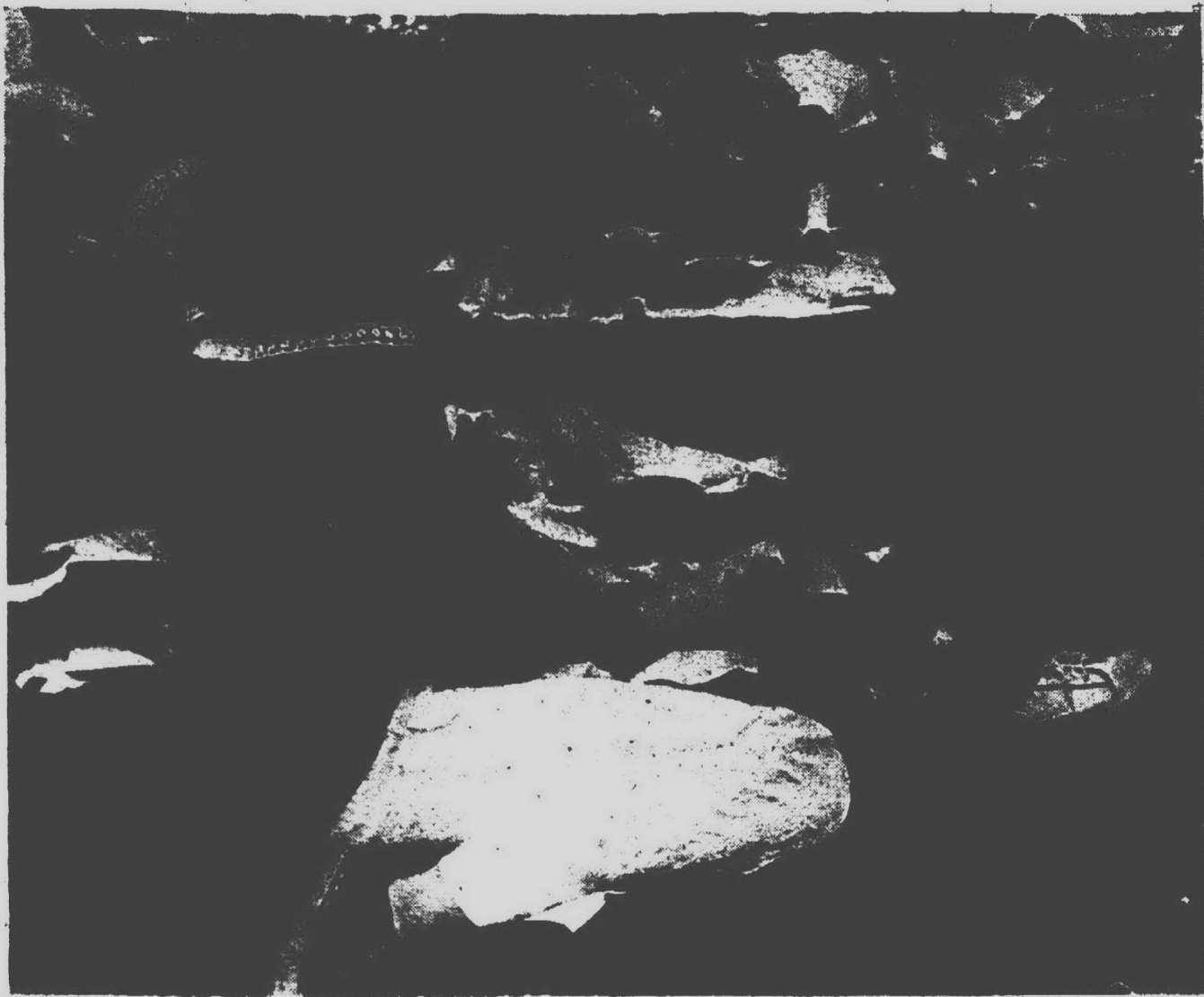


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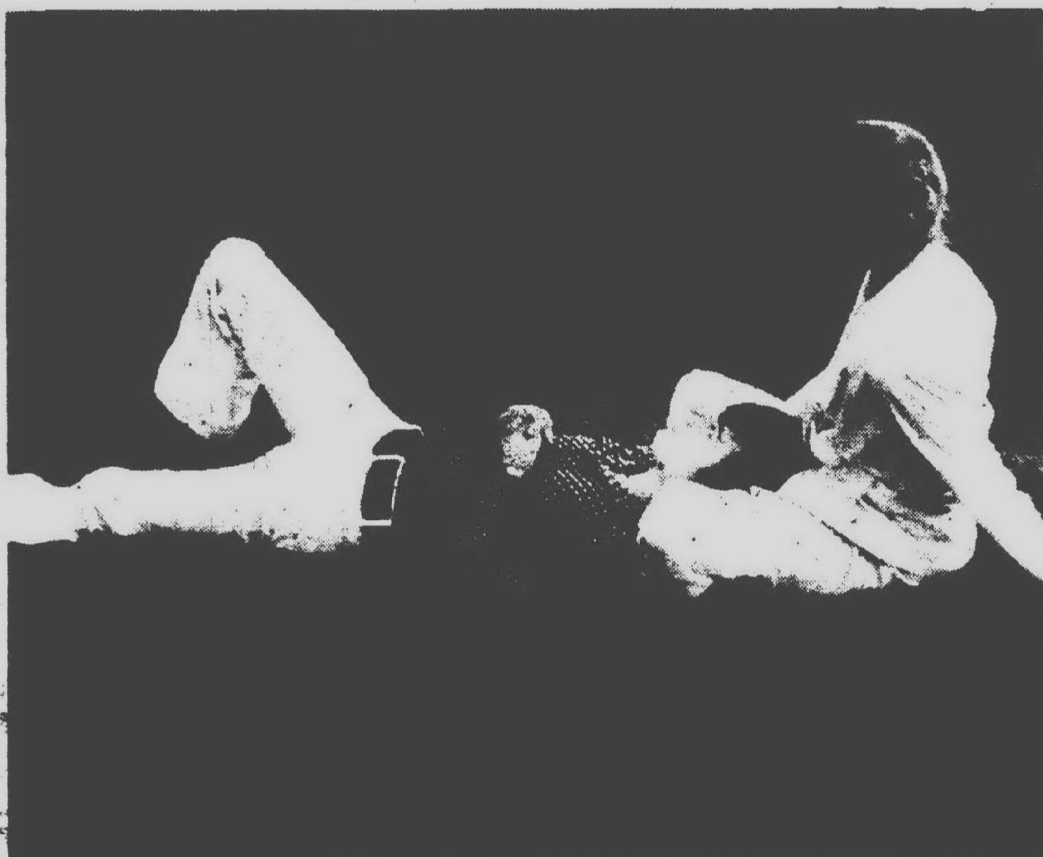
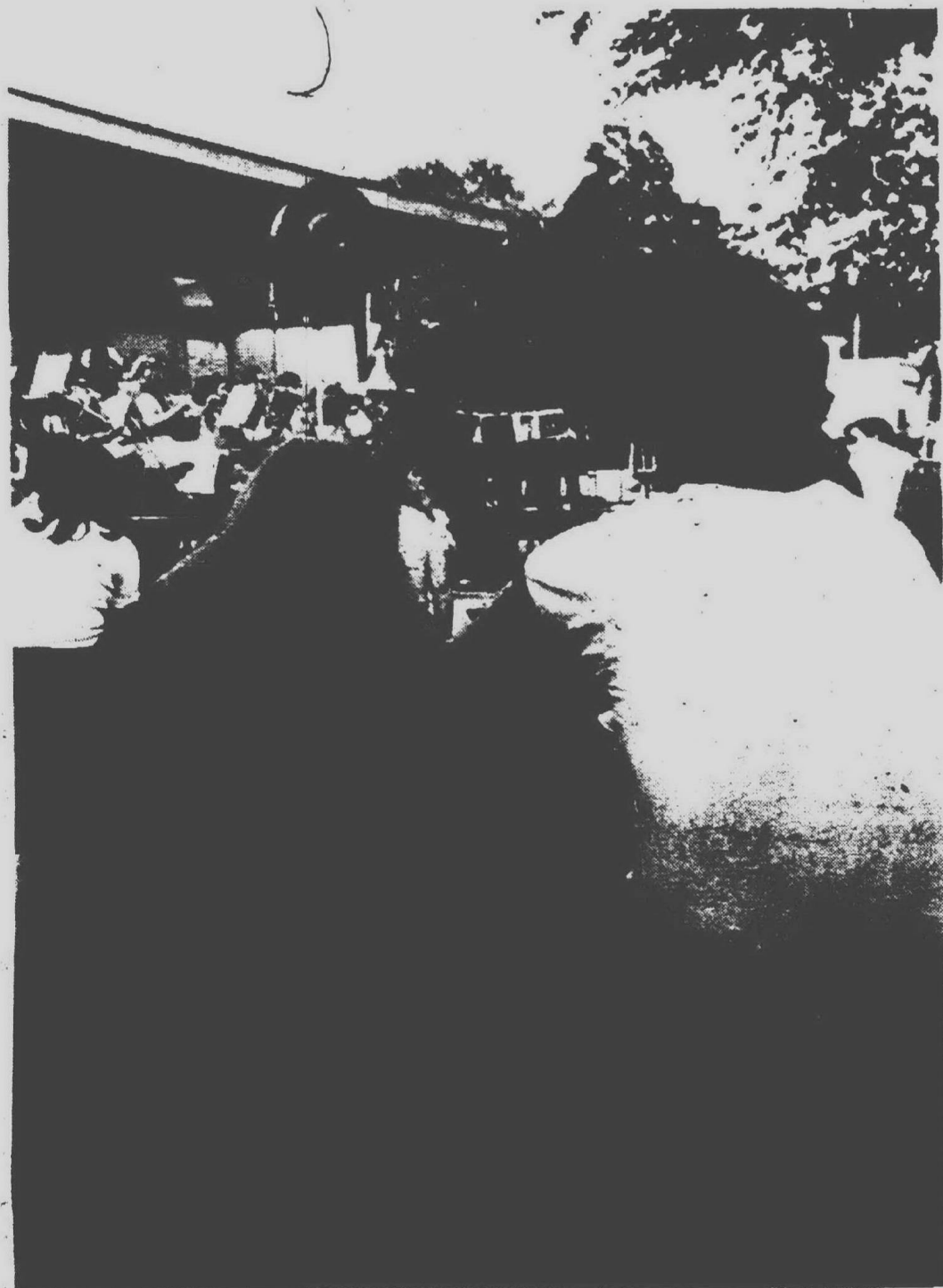
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## Kellogg concerts fun for all

# What role should governments' lawyers play?

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** This is the third part of a three-part series on what legal representation for local governments cost, how it's charged back and what role it plays -- or should play -- in the city of Plymouth, Plymouth and Canton townships and the Plymouth Community School District.

PLYMOUTH—Whether the issue is an easement ruling or a labor dispute, the quality of governmental legal service in the Plymouth-Canton area depends on how the lawyer views his job and how well he communicates with public officials.

"By definition I put out fires," said John Thomas, attorney for the Plymouth Community School District and a partner in Sempliner, Guth and

Thomas, attorneys for Canton Township.

Why do law firms undertake government business? Part civic duty, said Thomas. And even though it's not as lucrative as private practice, it is a steady business.

"Both jobs (Canton Township and school district attorneys) represent some security for the law firm," Thomas said. "They pay their bills regularly."

"It's an exposure kind of job," he said. "Although it does cost us clientele, it can gain us business."

The firm may attract clients, because working for the government gives it visibility and respectability, but there's also the risk of losing some.

Thomas cited one instance when his efforts on behalf of the school district

resulted in a pay increase for teachers being rescinded. "That made me the bad guy," he said.

He used to be a teacher in the Plymouth system, and he sees his experience in teaching as a considerable asset when working on district affairs.

School officials agree: "John Thomas has come this route," Hoben said.

"A CLIENT ALWAYS has to educate his lawyer," Thomas said. "They don't have to go as far with me. I've been through the thing. They (school officials) can converse with me in a shorthand fashion."

"We've had a beautiful relationship, and that's with seven different superintendents."

According to Thomas, legal needs in both the schools and Canton are increasing. "Billable time is going up," he said. "It's inevitable. People are much more conscious about litigation than they used to be."

Public officials, too, are more likely to resort to legal advice. "If there's any doubt in your mind, defer action until you have an attorney's opinion," said Supt. Hoben. "He may say 'your fanny's out in left field.'"

When does a matter demand a lawyer's written opinion? At \$40 or \$45 per hour, lines of communication which would allow anyone in the school offices or township hall to call up the lawyer would be very costly.

"I use my own judgment," Thomas said. "If the schools want a written opinion I want a letter from somebody in the central office."

"We don't give a board member an opinion just because he calls. I want a resolution of some sort first. Otherwise they (board members) might just be pitting themselves against each other on an issue."

Although he charges the schools \$45 per hour, both Thomas and Hoben note that many informal conversations go unbilled.

Hoben's policy is to clear all requests for written opinions through his office. "I don't think all the principals should be calling him (Thomas)," he said. "They will call me first and ask or I'll take it to John myself."

"After 18 years we wouldn't be without him," Hoben said of Thomas. "The volume of school law written this year alone is enough to keep them (Sempliner, Guth and Thomas) hopping. We need somebody to read that and stay current with it."

At what point would Hoben consider hiring a fulltime school attorney?

"I think it's unnecessary now," he said. The school district paid Sempliner, Guth and Thomas and their other attorneys about \$12,500 this year and has budgeted \$14,000 for 1974-75.

"When the legal budget gets up to \$20,000 or \$25,000 you begin to talk about hiring a sharp, young attorney," Hoben said. "We're talking about a school budget of more than \$13 million this year and \$14 million the next. It's a big business."

In Canton Township all legal questions are referred to Clerk John Flodin or Supervisor Phil Dingeldey before going to Sempliner, Guth and Thomas.

Canton paid SG&T about \$9,000 last year, using the firm on a part-time, hourly basis.

Robert Greenstein, a candidate for Canton Township supervisor, feels Canton should have a fulltime attorney on the payroll with offices in township hall.

"You've got to have a guy whose responsibility is not to his private practice," he said. "We want a guy whose only client is Canton."

Even conservative budget estimates place the cost of a fulltime attorney about \$15,000 to \$20,000 above the present arrangement.

"There will come a time when Canton needs its own attorney," said William Sempliner, a lawyer for Canton since the early 1950s. "But that time isn't here yet."

In Plymouth Township, Attorney Don Morgan receives \$40 per hour and a monthly retainer of \$50.

Although he hasn't advocated a fulltime attorney for the township yet, Trustee Frank Millington has questioned the value of the hourly fee and retainer for a part-time attorney who may often be busy with his private practice.

"We're paying enough to have a fulltime attorney now," he said. "I would be all for hiring a young man and giving him a challenge."

According to Morgan, who billed the township for more than \$14,000 last year, setting up a fulltime lawyer in township hall would be an expensive proposition. He estimated the cost of creating such a post would probably be about \$50,000 in its first year.

The City of Livonia is one of the few governmental units in the area to employ its own fulltime legal staff. City Attorney Harry Tatigian and two assistant city attorneys operate out of municipal offices on an annual budget of about \$130,000. The budget includes the cost of secretaries' salaries, office supplies and court expenses.

Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch sees an advantage in having a lawyer advise city officials on a part-time basis. "You can get a better quality attorney when city work is a sideline," she said.

Both Millington and Greenstein suggest that a governmental lawyer should take a more active role in township decision-making, becoming an advocate for the interests of the township rather than waiting for township officials to consult him for opinions.

"Counsel should have an extremely low profile," said school and Canton attorney Thomas. "We are not policy-making people."

Morgan agrees. "It's not my position to make planning decisions," he said. "When you have a hot political issue the policy makers would probably like to be absolved from making

policy judgments. The attorney's role is to show them just what the law is."

Like Thomas, Morgan expects township officials to screen requests for his written opinions. "The administrative bureaucracy would go into a tailspin if anybody who had a question could call me at all times."

The lines of communication in the City of Plymouth are less structured than those in the schools and townships for one simple reason: rather than charging by the hour for his advice, City Attorney Charles Lowe is on the municipal payroll and receives an annual retainer regardless of how his time is spent.

City officials who want written opinions from Lowe still clear their requests through City Manager Fred Yockey, however. "We've got to have a channel," Lowe said. "If everyone came to me for formal opinions I'd be here fulltime."

Like Thomas and Morgan, Lowe believes governmental attorneys should stay away from policy making. "When I do that I'm stepping on the toes of the city commission where I shouldn't be," he said. "I just try to keep the city out of trouble."

Lowe's retainer arrangement permits him greater flexibility than attorneys who bill by the hour.

"Some days I'll stroll over by city hall and anyone who has a question will ask it—it's an informal arrangement. Department heads feel free to call me, if it was on an hourly basis we wouldn't have this communication."

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# The Stroller

## An anniversary

Years have a way of slipping by so fast that one doesn't realize the swiftness of this flight of time.

For instance, it just doesn't seem possible that while the nation was celebrating the 100th anniversary of its independence on July Fourth, it also was the 40th anniversary of a fight that forever removed Joe Louis from the Ford factory where he had been "hustling" axes. It started him on his fabulous climb to the heavyweight championship of the world.

It was a fight that changed the entire course of the boxing industry and some of the incidents surrounding it have become legends of American sports.

It was July 4, 1934, and Joe, who cut a wide swath through the ranks of the Golden Gloves in the amateur circles to earn the title "The Brown Bomber," was matched with a lumbering giant named Jack Kracken in

Mills Stadium in Chicago.

It was Joe's first fight as a professional and the eyes of the boxing world were on him. His reputation as an amateur had spread across the country—but those wise in the ways of the ring awaited his pro debut before making any great claims for his future.

THE FIGHT WAS ONLY a few minutes under way when the old time critics were forced to change their minds. Moving with the ease of a cat, Joe maneuvered Kracken into position for a solid punch and knocked him out in the first round.

At the time the result wasn't an earth shaking affair, but to the Stroller it was the start of a fabulous experience, for he conducted the Golden Gloves tournament for the Detroit Free Press and had become one of Joe's advisors.

It isn't the memory of the fight, however, that lingers on. Instead, it is one of the incidents after the fight that is part of the Louis legend and reveals a humorous side of the Brown Bomber's career.

The incident came when Joe's handlers sat down with him and had their first discussion of money and the purses he was due to get in the years ahead.

He was told that his managers didn't intend to take any part of his purses until he reached the status where he would be paid at least \$1,000 a fight.

They informed him that he was paid \$50 for stopping Kracken the day before and that they were giving him the entire purse to do with as he chose.

His manager, John Roxborough, still smiles when he recalls what happened.

"If you ever have seen anything you liked and \$50 will buy it," Roxborough said, "now you can go out and get it." Joe, one of the great "deadpans" of the fight game at the time, took the money and shortly left the hotel for a trip down town.

ON HIS RETURN Joe was asked where he had been.

"Been shopping," he answered. Asked what he purchased, Joe refused to talk. He just stood mute as though that was nobody's business but his own.

Pleading didn't do any good, either. Joe just refused to talk.

A few hours later, Roxborough decided to search Joe's room—just out of curiosity.

He looked in every corner and in every closet but could find nothing.

## Our House freemedical clinic starts

PLYMOUTH—The Our House Crisis Center has announced plans for opening a free medical clinic which will focus on the diagnosis and treatment of venereal disease.

No definite date has been established for the opening of the clinic which will be located at the center, 185 S. Harvey.

Depending on the number of volunteer staff members the center is able to obtain, the clinic will also deal in areas such as problem pregnancy, birth control and general medical assistance.

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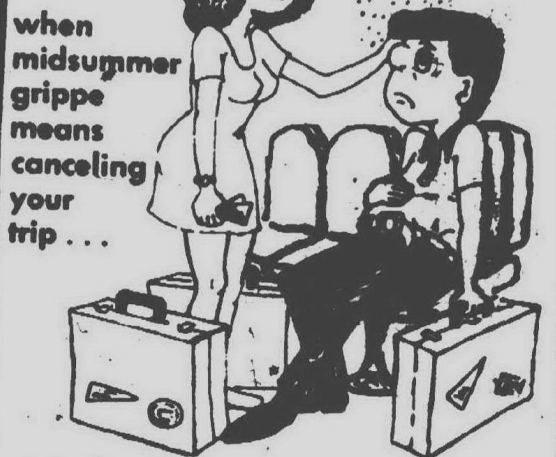
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# No cost to teachers for '30 and out' pension plan

The fate of a proposed non-contributory pension plan for state public school employees is still undecided. State representatives passed 98-0 House Bill 5088 last month, and it is now before the Senate appropriations committee.

The proposal calls for employers to contribute a percentage of the annual salary of each employee into the retirement fund.

In the "30 and out" plan, a teacher 30 years old with 30 years of service could retire on a pension calculated on the formula of 1 1/2 per cent of the last five years. The proposal also calls for an additional \$25 per month applied toward medical insurance. While there are presently no cost of living provisions, there is a one per cent catch-up for current retirees which goes back to 1956.

The bill stipulates vesting after 10 years service.

**PRESENTLY,** THE state's public school employees contribute five per cent of their salaries toward a pension fund. Since the contribution is part of salary, taxes are levied on the full amount.

If the non-contributory legislation is approved, there wouldn't be any tax on the five per cent paid by the employer, thus increasing take-home pay.

Dr. C. Nelson Grote, president of Schoolcraft College, who along with his teaching faculty and four other unions, is directly concerned, foresees the possibility the pension bill will make it through the Senate in record time.

If the House and Senate joint appropriations committee can resolve their budget expectations, Grote comments, "We may very well see this bill moving soon."

He feels certain the Legislature will pass a non-contributory pension bill, "I don't think there's any question about it. The Senate will pass a bill similar to House Bill 5088."

**THE PRESENT** plan, if approved, calls for implementation July 1 of this year and completion three years later.

As their contracts come up for renewal, various groups would be brought into the plan.

Grote is hopeful legislators will move both dates back and give the schools a year to begin implementation.

Therefore, if the legislation is approved, implementation would begin July 1975 and be complete in July 1978.

"This," Grote says, "would give us a year to study the financial implications and to build it into our 1975-76 budget."

As an example of the financial implications, he estimates that if the school had to put five per cent of its payroll into a pension fund right now, the yearly amount would be \$275,000.

As to the funding, Grote says, "For the first year we think they (the

state) ought to pay it all and after that their share."

He points out that 40 per cent of the college's income comes from the state; therefore, the state should pay 40 per cent of the five per cent which the school contributes.

"Otherwise," he says, "We'd have to eat that five per cent."

Grote says, "The first year of implementation will be the most critical. It depends on how you fold this into the salary and wages you negotiate."

**THERE IS AGREEMENT** among educators that the non-contributory plan, if approved, would be an important item in contract bargaining.

Grote says the tax-free five per cent contribution is actually equal to about a seven to a 7.5 per cent increase.

David McDowell, Clarenceville School District superintendent, predicts, "All districts in the state will consider this part of the salary improvements as they negotiate with the unions."

McDowell doesn't foresee the proposed plan as a hardship to the district.

"Our agreement with the teachers is for up to six per cent raise based on the cost-of-living from June to June."

He says that during the proposed three-year phase-in, employees may opt to do one of two things with their regular increases. They may take what will probably be the straight six per cent raise and continue to have the pension taken out of the paycheck, or they may elect to go on the non-contributory plan with the district paying the five per cent and have the additional one per cent added to the pay check.

"If the employee choses to go with the district paying five per cent into the plan and one per cent in step improvement, he will benefit in take-home pay. Now, he is paying income tax on the five per cent. If the district pays the pension, he wouldn't pay income tax on it."

He gives an example, "At the lowest step, there would be a yearly increase of \$180 in what they actually take home. At the top of our salary scale, a person with four dependents would actually take home \$300 more in a year."

**JOHN REYNOLDS**, executive director of the Livonia Education Association (LEA), says there is no doubt that, if approved, the plan will be put on the bargaining table as an automatic five per cent increase.

He isn't about to guess what the response from teachers will be. But he does feel that while the bill as written has flaws, most educators are supportive.

One flaw is no built-in cost of living increases.

And since the money can't be withdrawn, as with the present plan, the proposal favors those who plan to be or are definitely in the profession for a lifetime.

Reynolds says the idea originally was for the state to fund the plan.

"We didn't want the schools to fund it. We pushed for the state."

**UNDER THE "30 and out,"** which allows a career teacher to retire at 55, the district would be replacing teachers retiring at the top of the salary scale with new ones coming in at the lowest step.

Since it is the first change in 17 years on teacher retirement, many, but not all, are experiencing a sense of satisfaction. Several groups in Wayne County, under the leadership of George Trudell, are actively opposing the bill.

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# Senate challengers: A contrast

A booming-voiced Redford Township trustee and a soft-spoken Young Democrats chairman, both running for a State Senate nomination, see preservation of open space as a key local and state problem.

Don Christie, the trustee and veteran of township and UAW political

wars, and Michael O'Shea, the young newcomer, seek the Democratic nomination in the Aug. 6 primary to face State Sen. Carl Pursell, unopposed in the Republican primary.

The 14th Senate District covers Redford Township, Livonia, Plymouth and Northville. Both Democratic candidates are from Redford.

Christie told an audience of Democrats in Livonia last week he "won't

be a puppet for any special interest vote" and told of his "parting of the ways" with United Auto Workers leadership over its non-support of State Rep. John Bennett (D-Redford).

"I'm not going to try to out-yell you, Don," said O'Shea, head of the

Wayne County YD group. He called for more funds to local government to fight crime and supported consumer protection bills such as licensing and testing of auto and television repairmen.

Here is how they answered three audience questions:

What is your view of state land use legislation?

O'Shea: "We need more restrictions and green belts." He favored preserving Glenhurst golf course in Redford Township from private development.

Christie: Gov. Milliken "flip-flopped" on the issue. The majority of developable land in the state is controlled by townships. "Natural water basins shouldn't be filled in."

Discuss collective bargaining, faculty rights and teacher strikes.

Christie: "As a member of the Experimental Model Makers of America, I had to fight the UAW." Ninety per cent of the "silly strikes we have had could have been eliminated through the right type of mediation and arbitration." Teachers should have the right to negotiate.

O'Shea: "The right to strike is the most powerful weapon" teachers have. "We can't take it away." He advocated mediation.

Should 18-year-olds have the right to run for public office?

O'Shea: It's all right to have the minimum age for the governor at 30, but others should be lowered from 21 to 18.

Christie: The House lowered the age, but the "Senate knocked it down."

## Local reps back licensing bill

State representatives from this area have voted unanimously in favor of a bill designed to curb unfair and deceptive car repair practices in Michigan.

Representatives William Keith (D-Garden City), John Bennett (D-Redford Twp.), Robert Geake (R-Northville), John Markes (D-Westland), Thomas Brown (D-Westland), and Raymond Smit (R-Ann Arbor) all cast "yes" votes for the bill which would require the licensing of approximately 60,000 auto mechanics and 30,000 repair services if it becomes law.

Though the bill cleared the House by a vote of 67 to 33, sources in Lansing say the bill will face heavy opposition in the Senate. House and Senate critics argue that the measure could increase the cost of car repair substantially, and that administration of the proposed law could cost as much as \$2 million a year.

However, should the bill make it

through the Senate and be signed by the governor, who favors the consumer protection measure it would be phased in over a five year period under the direction of a new division of motor vehicle services within the Secretary of State's office.

The new division would register all facilities which repair cars, trucks, motorcycles and motor homes, and certify employees who service such vehicles.

The bill would also require licensed repair shops to supply written itemized estimates of charges before undertaking repairs, and would make a false statement punishable as a felony.

## SC enrollment hits new high

Schoolcraft College has just reached its highest enrollment during the spring session in the history of the college.

Registrar Russell Bogarin reports 2,526 students are attending classes this spring, collectively generating 10,994 credit hours.

Compared to last year, it represents 192 more students and an additional 1,213 credit hours.

While 1,175 students attend day classes, 1,184 students attend evening classes and 166 students are attending both day and evening.

Most students attend part-time during the short eight-week session as witnessed by a total of 2,520 part-time and six full time students.

Students enrolled in applied science courses outnumber those enrolled in transfer courses by 426.

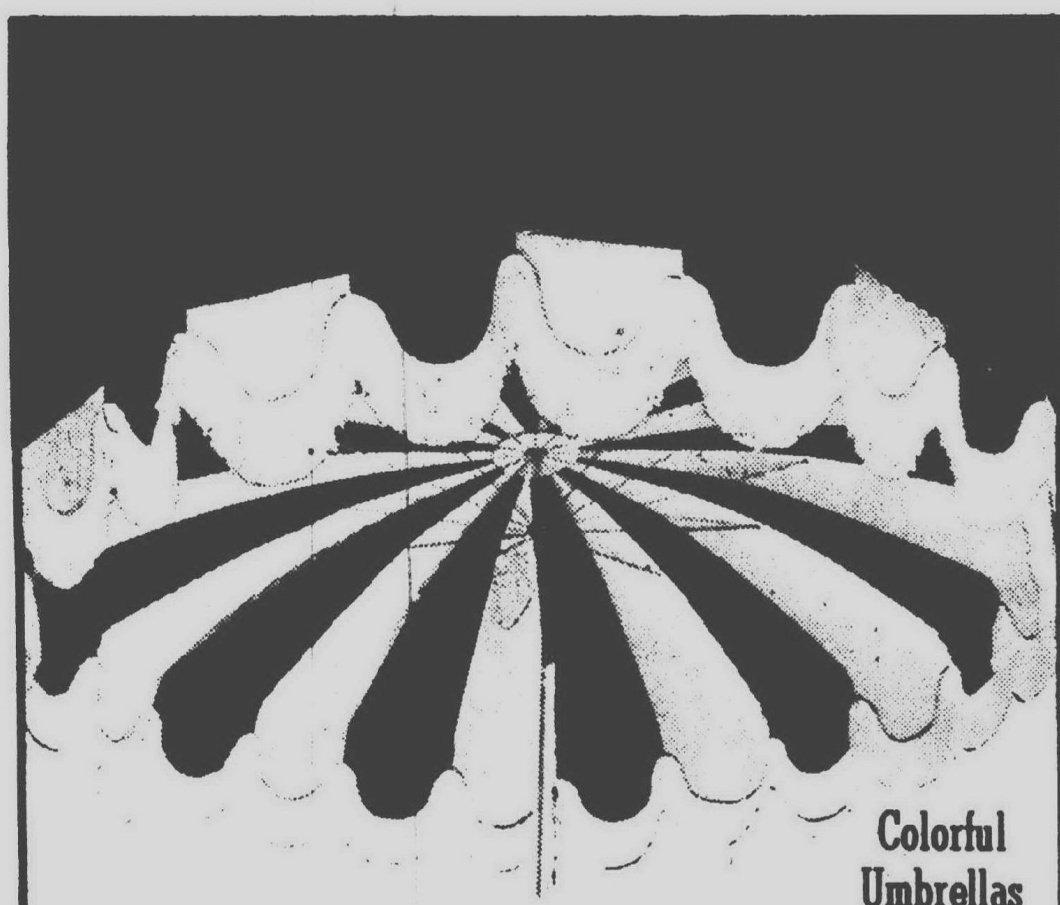
The registrar noted that besides these totals, another 214 students are enrolled in community service courses giving Schoolcraft a grand total of 2,740 spring credit students.

"Passage of this bill will have great significance for the people of Plymouth, where four pupils have been killed on the highways in the last six years and where six accidents already have been recorded near schools," said Pursell.

"The bill earlier had passed the House of Representatives by a vote of 103 to 0 and it passed the Senate Thursday by a vote of 31 to 0.

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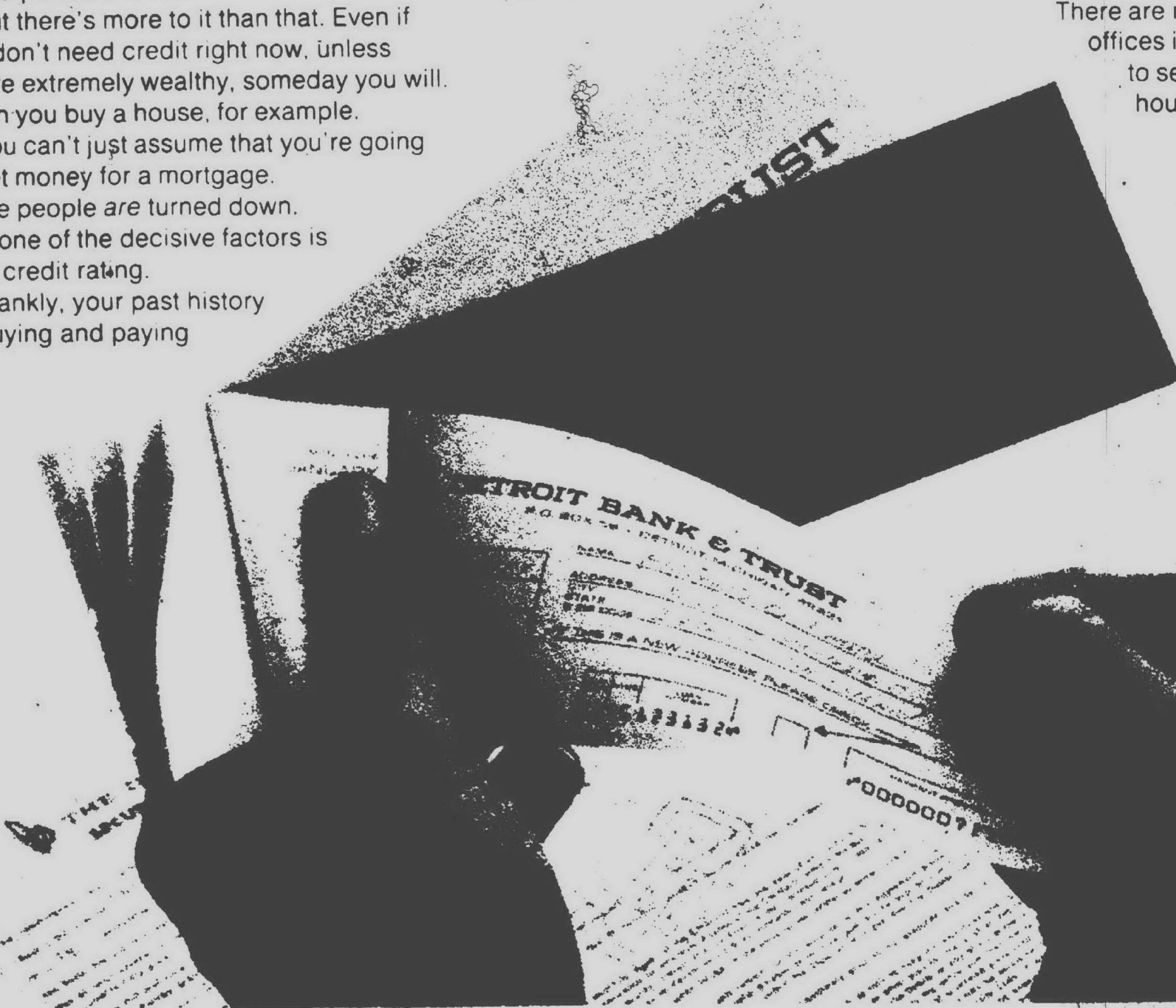
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# How 5 Dem hopefuls view inflation issue

If a Democrat defeats Republican incumbent Marvin Esch in the 2nd Congressional District in November, he or she will probably oppose price controls and favor more progressive taxes for social security.

The differences between the five persons seeking the Democratic nomination in the Aug. 6 primary are in personality and background more than in fundamental doctrine.

They appeared last week in a 1½ hour panel sponsored by the Democratic organization in the Wayne County portion of the 2nd, which includes Livonia, Plymouth and Northville; eastern Washtenaw County, and nearly all of Monroe County. While no one was hissed or booed, the audience in Livonia's Bentley High cafeteria was heavily weighted with John Reuther supporters with Ronald Egnor having the second strongest cheering section.

HERE IS HOW all five responded to some questions:

Should price controls be tried again as a method of controlling inflation?

Theo Williams, a World War II veteran and professional engineer from Ann Arbor, said controls were "not effective" and "hurt the working person."

Ron Egnor, Ypsilanti attorney, said "across-the-board controls won't work." He proposed selected price controls on such items as oil along "excessive profits" taxes. Egnor also advocated increasing exemptions on personal income taxes. He called the inflation "very, very difficult... Economists don't even know what to do."

Dr. Ed Pierce, Ann Arbor clinic founder and former city councilman there, called for "stiff profit taxes," singling out the oil industry.

Marjorie Lansing, associate professor of political science at Eastern Michigan University, favored a "rollback in fuel prices." Insisting inflation is a complex problem, Mrs. Lansing said "Nixon goofed. He doesn't listen to his own economists."

John Reuther, a political staff professional most of his adult life, advocated "the rollback in fuel prices which Nixon vetoed... Food and fuel are three-quarters of the price problem." He said excess profits taxes wouldn't work because profits could be concealed in too many ways.

Mrs. Lansing, asked to amplify her views on inflation, said President Nixon's wheat sale to the Russians set off a series of changes that were aggravated by the fuel crisis.

Should social security benefits be the same for all men and women? (A wife's benefits are a percentage of a husband's if she hasn't worked in covered employment.)

Reuther "strongly supports" equality. He added that the social security tax is regressive (takes a higher percentage of low incomes than of high incomes), proposed broadening the taxable income base to \$25,000, and said one-third of the revenue should come from the general fund.

Mrs. Lansing quoted retiring U.S. Rep. Martha Griffiths (D-Detroit) as saying social security needed a "real overhaul" and added that taxes take a "real bite" out of incomes.

Dr. Pierce called for raising the tax base to \$20,000 and advocated dependent exemptions for social security, the same as under the federal income tax.

Williams called the tax structure "unfair," said people in Monroe County are "excited" about the problem and declared the federal budget could be cut by \$26 billion by avoiding defense cost overruns.

Egnor said equality of benefits is "fundamental." Homemakers don't pay social security taxes, but Egnor said he had heard witnesses in court damage cases place a \$500,000 lifetime value on a housewife's services. He deplored "bureaucratic mumbo-jumbo" in the social security administration.

Are you in favor of cross-district busing for the sole purpose of racial integration?

Williams is opposed. "A poll shows only nine per cent of whites and 11 per cent of blacks" favor busing.

Dr. Pierce, an avowed "integrationist," gave a "don't know" answer, saying he would "support the law of the land" and that any busing should be "safe and educationally sound."

(This represents a change in view. On May 14, the Ypsilanti Press reported that "only Pierce indicated he favored a cross-district busing plan, saying he would 'probably support a metropolitan school district.'")

Referring to Rep. Esch's "second closest school" busing amendment to an education bill, Pierce said "I'm tired of people like Esch playing with people's emotions. It's up to the Supreme Court, not Congress. Esch knows the Supreme Court will declare his amendment null and void."

Reuther hasn't "seen evidence that cross-district busing would bring quality education... If I felt cross-district busing would achieve better education, I would make my stand there." He quoted black Rep. Shirley Chisholm (D-N.Y.) as saying busing "would kill community control of schools."

Mrs. Lansing said in "some places it would work" but said she "needs evidence it would improve education." If the purpose is to integrate, she sees other ways to achieve integration, notably employment and housing.

Egnor's own legal opinion is that the Supreme Court will reverse Federal Judge Stephen Roth in the Detroit-suburban case. "I don't think busing 40 or 50 miles will provide quality education."

THE CANDIDATES and their supporters took a couple of pokes at each other.

Raising what has come to be known as the "carpetbagger" issue, Egnor referred to a "lack of seniority" on the part of Reuther, who was born in Detroit but has been a resident only since the end of the McGovern presidential campaign. Egnor said Esch will discuss the Reuther issue if Democrats don't. Egnor, born in West Virginia and raised in Michigan, said the length of residency is not as important as a congressman's "need to know the blood, sweat and tears of a community."

Reuther responded: "I'll allow the people to decide Aug. 6 if I've spent too little time in the district."

Dr. Pierce, prodded for his views on amnesty for Vietnam War dodgers, said he was "in general for amnesty... The war was a grievous political and moral error." He would allow

individual amnesty requests to be decided by boards composed of Vietnam War veterans.

(This represents a modification of his earlier position in favor of unconditional amnesty.)

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## HRP picks congressional candidate

The Human Rights Party (HRP) of Michigan has selected Phil Carroll as its candidate for the 2nd Congressional District.

In platform sessions, the HRP voted to amend its preamble to declare itself a socialist party "to clarify the differences between HRP and the two major capitalist parties."

The health care plank was amended to include calls for prohibition of involuntary incarceration, oppressive use of therapeutic treatments such as electrical shock, aversion, and chemo therapy, and to guarantee civil rights to mental patients.

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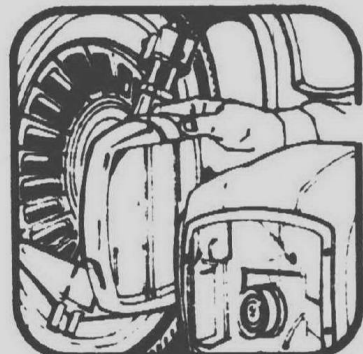
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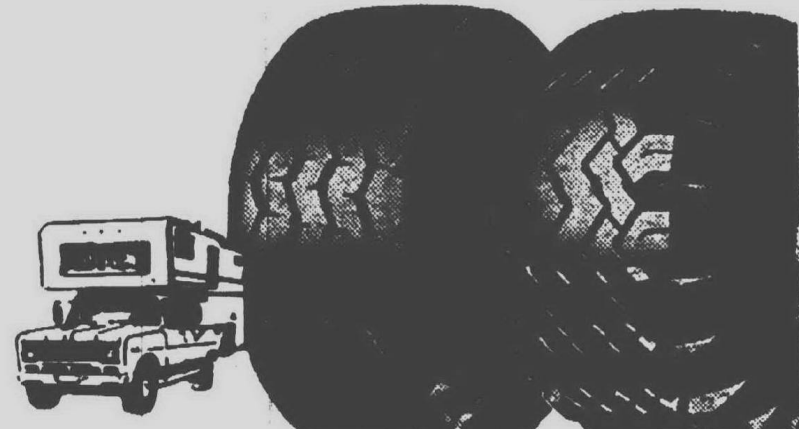

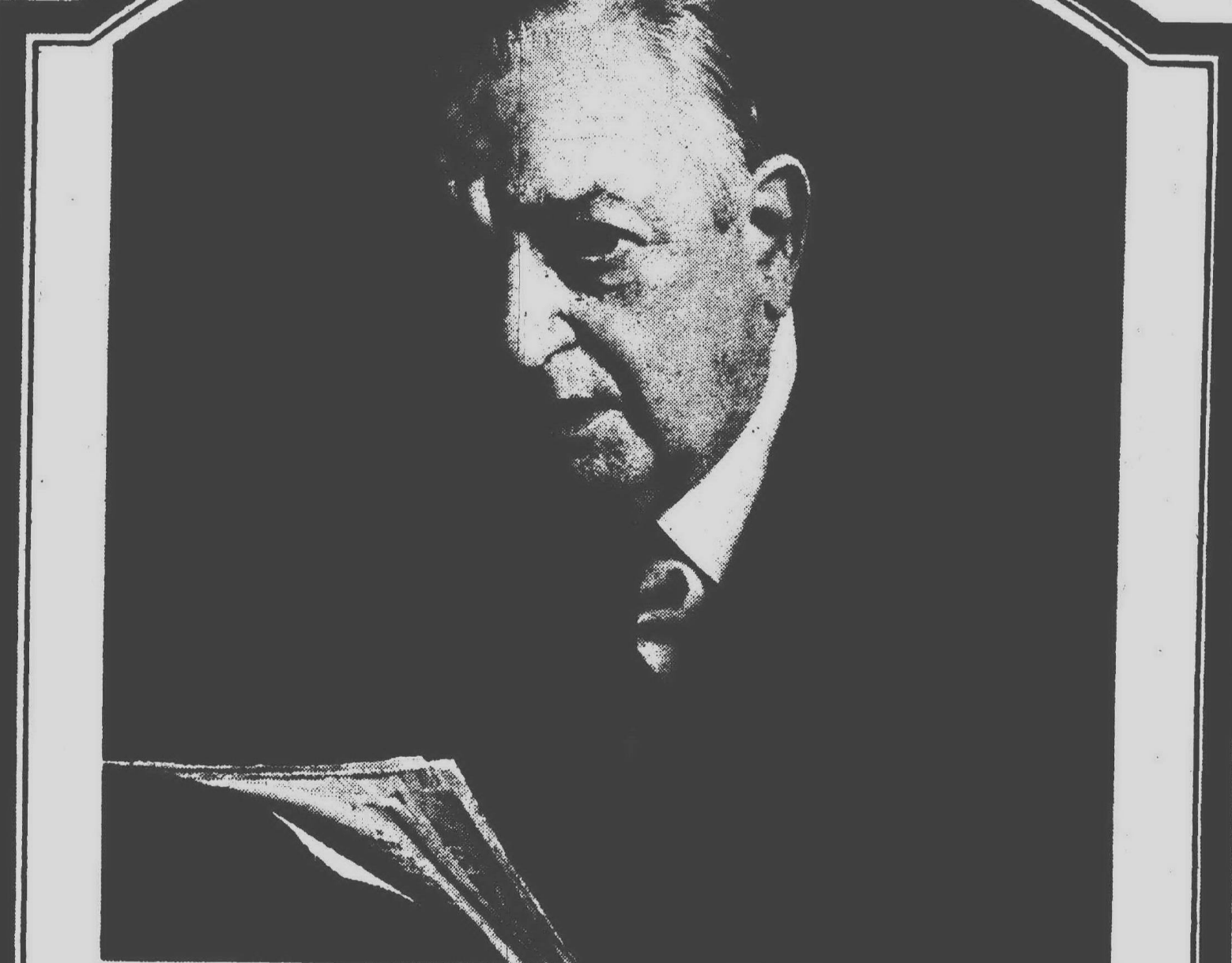

"But so far that hasn't happened," she said.

The gardeners who are taking advantage of Canton's free plots aren't the only "victory gardeners" around.

Several families and young adults have planted plots through Youth Inc. which had a field at North Territorial

and Napier roads donated by Sirrom Investment Company.

After hiring a Plymouth Township man to plow their plots, the Youth Inc. gardeners divided up the area into small pieces and assigned them to those interested in growing their own vegetables.

Some of the plots have gone unused, but many have been well tended.

After two months of gardening, none claim to be horticulture experts, but you can be sure they'll be out

there again next year growing radishes, onions, cabbage, lettuce, tomatoes, peppers, squash, cucumbers, beans, corn, peas and even rhubarb.

## City paving contract awarded

"Extremely pleased" with the price was the comment from City Manager Fred Yockey. A report from the purchasing department showed budget costs for the 1974 program were set at \$293,954 for construction and \$58,790 for engineering contingencies.

The commission also closed out the 1973 paving program with transfer of \$17,970 from the major street fund and \$19,598 from the capital improvement fund to the special assessment fund to cover additional costs for last year's project.

"I'm concerned about the city putting any more (money) on top of \$100,000."

"The project has merit. There's been too much work on this project to let it fall by the wayside."

"The cost of the project is really slight to the city — we can't lose much at all," Battermann added.

Bob Utter, a director of the Pilgrim Towers group, praised Houk's efforts thus far toward the project and urged the commission to continue its involvement.

Former Mayor James McKeon spoke in favor of the city's participation saying, "I'm not prepared to advocate this project per se... but I caution you on turning down any participation in this project just because you don't have all the information."

He said there is a pressing need for senior citizen housing in the city.

After the commission voted in favor of continuing with the project, Moehle proposed that the commission ask the City Housing Commission to investigate expanding Tonquish Creek Manor, the city's senior citizen housing unit, at its present or alternate sites. The commission agreed unanimously.

# New Rieger begonia has super-sized blooms



THE SPECTACULAR Schwabenland Rieger begonia with its luxuriant foliage and super-sized flowers is becoming more available and popular in this country.

Nothing warms a flower lover's heart so much as the introduction of a new, larger version of an old favorite. And, if it takes a bit of sleuthing to track it down, so much the better.

There is something to be said for being the first on your block to display a begonia plant of the outstanding new Rieger variety. With its luxuriant foliage and super-sized flowers, the Rieger is the begonia-fancier's counterpart to the gardener's three-pound tomato.

Developed by the German firm of Otto Rieger and introduced to the U.S. in 1972 by an Ohio firm, the Rieger begonia is available in ever-increasing supply at florists and nurseries, according to the Society of American Florists.

A FIBROUS ROOTED begonia that rivals the showy tuberous rooted begonia, the Rieger comes in an upright multi-stemmed form (Schwabenland) and a single-stemmed form (Aphrodite).

While the Aphrodite is recommended for use in hanging baskets, the Schwabenland potted plants have rapidly become highly favored because of their heavy-blooming and striking colors, including a glorious red, as well as pinks, oranges and rose.

Both types are durable plants, easy to maintain in the home or office and

resistant to powdery mildew, a problem that has discouraged U.S. production of large flowering begonias for many years.

LIKE ALL BEGONIAS, the Rieger is a shade lover and should be protected from summer sun. Let the soil become dry between waterings, and water potted plants thoroughly to flush out salts that can accumulate in the soil.

Although resistant to mildew, care should be taken to avoid wetting the foliage of the Rieger begonia when watering. Keep the plant in a cool (68-70 degrees), well-ventilated, dry area.

WHEN A POTTED plant outgrows its pot and seems near the end of a blooming cycle, it can be renewed by pruning and repotting. Let the soil dry for a period of seven to ten days; then, cut the main shoots back to three to four inches, using a sharp knife or razor blade.

Water the plant sparingly until the

light solution of fertilizer weekly. In three to four months your Rieger begonia will be in full bloom again.

Visitors to Europe this summer will see the Rieger begonia everywhere, in window boxes, as bedding plants and as bright flowering plants in the home, says SAF. As the Rieger becomes more widely available in the U.S., this plant can be expected to brighten many American homes with its pleasing form.

## Pest Of The Week



### ELM BEATLE

This small beetle of olive green color with indistinct black stripes on wing covers appears in homes at this time of year. They eat nothing, but are a nuisance.

They migrate from the elm trees to find shelter in the fall. This time of year they are moving to the outside to

lay eggs as the weather warms up.

CONTROL: A household fly spray can be used indoors. Probably the best method is to vacuum them up when found. Outdoors, spray elm trees with Sevin 50 wp, two tablespoons per gallon of water, in mid-June.

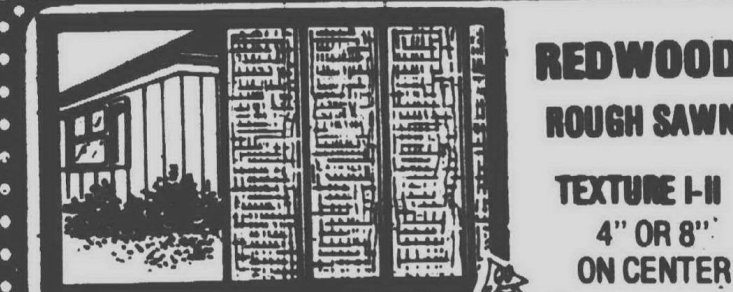

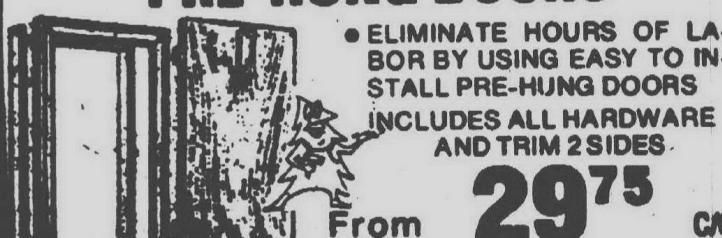

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# Meadow Brook Hall tour; glimpse of a golden era

The 100-room Tudor mansion built by Mr. and Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson in the late 1890s at a cost of \$4 million is now open to the public six days a week.

Tourists may visit the historic Meadow Brook Hall on the campus of Oakland University, Rochester, Tuesday through Saturday and Sunday afternoon through August.

Children and adults alike will also enjoy Knoke Cottage, a playhouse which the Wilsons built in 1926 for Frances Dodge on her 12th birthday. The six-room mini mansion has nearly life size furnishings and a complete kitchen built to the scale of a 12 year old. Dolls, dishes, carriages and bassinets, are all there just as they were when the cottage was completed for the young girl.

Meadow Brook Hall is a part of the Wilson bequest to the people of Michigan for the purpose of founding Oakland University. In order to raise funds to preserve the heritage of the home which receives no tax support, the university opened the hall in September 1971 for public activities, individual and group tours, meetings, special events and live-in conferences. Proceeds help underwrite the cost of maintaining the home and its original furnishings.

The home reflects a lifestyle that flourished in the age of auto barons and oil tycoons and stands as a monument to an era that may never come again.

Entire walls of hand carved paneling rise from stone and parquet floors. Secret doorways and panels lead to hidden staircases and rooms concealed within the walls themselves. Crystal chandeliers and hand-made hardware, gold faucets and marble fireplaces, silk covered walls and inlaid furniture give evidence of the opulence of another time.

All the family living and sleeping rooms are open to the public and conferences work, sleep and eat in the rooms originally occupied by the Wilson household.

There is a \$3.50 charge for touring the house and grounds for adults. Admission for senior citizens and children is \$2.

Hours are 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. Sunday tours begin at 1 p.m. with the last tour at 4 p.m. Food service is available on some days.

Take I-75 to Oakland University exit about 25 miles north of Detroit and follow the signs to Meadow Brook Hall.

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# Watergate shrillness bores, alienates public

I got to talking with the girl at the pay booth at Metropolitan Airport late one night last week and mentioned that I was a newspaperman.

"Oh, them," she sneered. "Well, they don't print the truth. Why don't they, anyway?"

That seemed a pretty heavy question for 1 a.m., so I said, "We try, but sometimes it's pretty hard," paid my bill, and drove off.

But her instant reaction nagged at me all the way home. The next day the great brouhaha about leaks and ethics in journalism broke in Washington. Sen. Barry Goldwater said certain members of the Washington Post's staff should be indicted for treason, and others argued that the institution of the unidentified leak was crucial for honesty in our society.

It hurts, but the conclusion is inescapable. The American public is troubled, suspicious, and perhaps hostile to the press, the TV networks and the radio news.

ON THINKING it over, I reject out of hand the notion that newspeople consciously produce lies masquerading as the truth. All my own experience in this business, and all the conversations I have ever had with newspeople, validate this conclusion.

But the public presumption that the press is lying is so pervasive that there must be some reasons for it.

The first is that many people simply don't like to be told bad news, and for some the reaction upon hearing bad news is to get sore at the bearer. In ancient times, the custom was to kill the messenger bringing bad news to the king, and I suspect this instinct is far from dead in the 1970s.

Times these days are pretty bad. We keep hearing about inflation and possible depression world-wide; we are bombarded with stories depicting surliness in post-Watergate Washington; these newspapers constantly run stories about increased taxes and uneasiness in the auto industry here at home.

It's not unnatural for someone, upon reading all this stuff, to conclude that things can't be all that bad, and that the news media are lying.

It may be natural, but I think it's a false conclusion.

THERE IS, HOWEVER, a second and more valid reason for public suspicion of the news media.

This has to do with the way in which news events are emphasized. Any given newspaper reader or TV watcher has a particular pattern of significance by which the news is evaluated.

Should a newspaper or TV program play up a story which the reader thinks should be played down, that reader or viewer is likely to begin to entertain suspicions that the newspaper or newscaster is distorting the news or even lying.

I don't happen to believe that this is a legitimate conclusion, but I do have a lot of sympathy with people who feel that way.

Watergate and the way the media have played the story are good examples. For months, now, we have had nothing but Watergate blaring at us on the evening news or new revelations of scandal leaping at us from page one. Right now, I

think much of the public is bored sick at Watergate, and many people who are bored may have come to the conclusion that the media are all engaged in a gigantic conspiracy to hound President Nixon from office.

I do not believe that; I do believe that Watergate and its associated activities constitute surely the most serious political and constitutional scandal this nation has ever experienced.

But I do not believe that this justifies constant pounding away at the story by the media, for to do so simply ignores human intolerance for a high level of crisis over many months.

In recent weeks, the media appear to have started treating the Watergate story in more reflective and measured ways. It's about time, for continued shrillness can only lead to scepticism and outright hostility.

## A lesson for Westland and others

Suburbs in the metropolitan Detroit area may be edging a foot or two closer to recognizing their place in the region.

This was indicated recently with Southfield's joining the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

A new city joining the council isn't news, but the new membership of a city the size and geographical proximity of Southfield to Detroit is important.

Southfield, with 76,000 population, is one of the biggest suburbs to join SEMCOG. The others are Livonia and Pontiac.

Still missing from the membership rolls are such large cities as Westland, Royal Oak and Warren, among others.

SUBURBAN officials at times tend to look inward toward their own problems and ignore the circumstances just outside their boundaries.

Most suburbs usually fear any intrusion of "outsiders" interfering with purely local problems.

But those suburbs forget that the solutions to local problems are usually found from outside resources anyway.

SEMCOG's primary function is to develop and coordinate regional planning for transportation, land use, recreation and open space, water supply, sewage disposal, storm drainage, criminal justice, manpower development and housing.

Westland, whose city council turned down Mayor Eugene McKinney's recommendation to join SEMCOG several years ago, may be missing an excellent chance to gain valuable information and advice in solving local problems.

So are Garden City and Redford Township. Although the Westland council and administration are still in the midst of a financial crisis, the \$3,900 membership fee for SEMCOG is well spent.

WESTLAND IS having problems in many areas SEMCOG specializes in.

These include land use, open space and recreation, transportation, criminal justice and housing.

Actually, some Westland officials have been moving toward a regional approach to local prob-

lems anyway, as evidenced by their initiating a six-community authority to develop a public transportation system.

On land use, open space and recreation, talks were held last year with three neighboring cities on the purchase of the Birch Hill golf course for a city facility.

A new crime prevention bureau with officers from five suburban cities has been formed with state and federal funds to combat the growing problem of break-ins of homes and businesses.

With the continuing debate in Westland and other suburbs on how many apartments should be allowed, certainly SEMCOG's data bank and staff

people should provide valuable information on housing.

Some advice may be given to Westland officials who are concerned about the lack of development of large single-family houses although a new zoning category has been created to encourage that kind of building.

WITH AN estimated 100,000 population, Westland is the third largest Wayne County suburb, behind Dearborn and Livonia.

Officials in past years have encouraged the community to "grow up" and start acting like the large city it is.

One way to start is to make an investment in the future and join SEMCOG.

They may be able to save a few dollars on reports from SEMCOG they have to pay for but would get free as members.

### Why party becomes a chore

I always shudder when my spouse says, "We owe so many people -- we ought to have a party."

It's not a trivial statement, because a lot of people feel that once they are invited to a person's home, they have to return the favor, forgetting that the reason they were invited in the first place is that the people apparently enjoyed their company.

There are some people who carry the eye for an eye and a party for a party to extremes. They keep charts on where they have been and give numerical scores as to whether it was just a cocktail party or whether it included dinner, and whether dancing was included.

THERE ARE some other people who give three parties in a row, with the same format, so they can pay back their obligations for the year. And there are others who have one great big party each year.

There are even sneaky people who select a date for their party when they know most of their friends will be out of town, so they get credit for giving a party without having to perform.

An extreme case is the person who drives around at night to see if newspapers are stacked up on the front stoop, as a final test as to who is out of town.

I have even known people to wonder if they should go back to a home after a funeral, in case it counts as a party.

The trouble with planning to give a party is that it sometimes becomes more of a balancing off of obligations than something at which the host can have fun. Some of the worst parties I have ever been to have been in my house. On the other hand, some of the best I have been to have been at home, when there was care in planning.

MAYBE IT IS my advanced age, but the thrill of a party seems to be waning. Too often they fall into a pattern of too-long cocktail hours with inane conversation -- where the guy who has just changed jobs for the fourth time this year wants to explain why he is an expert in his product line.

The hostess has usually gone to great lengths to prepare a scrumptious dinner, but it doesn't get served until 11 o'clock. After three hours of drinking and munching on hors d'oeuvres, much of the hostess' work is for naught.

I think that if I had my druthers, I would opt for the small, intimate dinner party, with a short cocktail hour after a movie or a tennis match.

Then you have an opportunity to talk with the people you want to talk to about things that are really interesting to you and to them and enjoy some of the best food in the area.

The only problem with this kind of party is that you have to have so many of them to pay back for all of the other parties you have attended.

No such luck in the Detroit area--stations here run free spots for charities and conservation when there are no paid commercials, just so we won't learn what commercial-free TV is like.

Isn't it ironic that with seven TV stations available in the Detroit area, the only one showing the brilliant "America" series is CKLW--in Canada?

The amount of classical music available on weekday AM radio is shriveling up. Early this year, there were just two programs left--WJR's Karl Haas and CBE's "Off the Record." So what did WJR do? It shifted Haas to an afternoon time, and during the DST season he conflicts with the

CBE offering. Thus, without changing its own budget, WJR effectively reduced the amount of classic available in this area by 50 per cent. Boo, WJR!

And News Front magazine reports that in one month the number of commercials on prime time network TV rose to 3,319, an increase of 88 per cent over the 1,769 of a decade ago.

One network has plunked down \$5 million for the right to screen the classic "Gone with the Wind." It'll be interesting to see if they play the old timing game with commercials--you know, where they wait 20 minutes between commercials at the beginning of the movie to get you hooked, then sock you every eight minutes at the end.

It was good to see Jerry Chiapetta get his own "Michigan Outdoors" TV program again. Outdoor sports reporting is rife with "freebies," plugs and payola from resorts and equipment manufacturers. In this mudhole, Chiapetta stands out as a highly competent, honest broadcast newsmen who doesn't lick the boots of sponsors, potential sponsors or sportsmen's pressure groups.



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
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

## Scenario completed

I would like to suggest Power's commentary on the particular meeting and issue in question hardly supports his avowed position as "watchdog for the public interest."

## 'They just aren't geared to credit for women'

"I've never been refused credit," says Dr. Audrey Gomon, learning specialist at Franklin High School in Livonia.

"But I've run into unbelievable confusion and inefficiency in trying to establish credit in my own name. The system just isn't geared for any circumstances other than the husband as main provider."

Dr. Gomon explained she is "not widowed or divorced or separated or angry with my husband" but wants credit cards in her own name because she travels a lot directing counseling workshops and wants to keep records straight.

Right now, she said, she is checking on why she was turned down for an oil company card, but has been told there's no reason why it should not be granted.

Not so simple was her experience in getting a charge card in her own name in a clothing store.

"First, they just put my name on the card and kept the same number on the account," she said. "I went back and asked for a separate account. So they restricted my husband's use of the account, but sent him the bill."

"I explained that wasn't quite what I had in mind and they said it would be straightened out. So the next time I had dealings with the store I was told their records showed my husband had restricted me from charging anything."

"By that time I was ready to start screaming." Dr. Gomon also told of an earlier experience when she and her husband had separate checking accounts in the same bank again to keep records straight.

"His was overdrawn," she recalled, "so the bank transferred money from my account to cover his checks and let MY checks bounce."

"I was furious, but when I asked why they explained it was strictly for our benefit—it wouldn't do my husband's credit rating any good to have his checks bouncing."

For Dr. Gomon, "it's the little stuff that is offensive."

"The whole implication," she added, "is that your employment is illusory and temporary and that the male employment is what matters."

## 'Credit refused—no explanation,' says Livonian

Two happenings led Mrs. Marion Cizmas, divorced and remarried, mother of five, student and working woman, to explore the matter of credit for women.

The first began when this Livonian, then divorced and on a fairly new job, applied for a clothing store charge account. She was told it would be approved when she had 18 months of steady employment.

By the time she had completed that requirement, she was remarried "and they would issue it only in my husband's name," she said. "They would only say it was company policy."

Later she sought, from the professional credit union she belonged to, a loan to buy a car. Not unless her husband would co-sign, she was told, "but I was the one who would use it and make the payments."

A parish credit union eventually gave her a smaller loan than she had sought originally, and then Mrs. Cizmas decided to find out what sort of credit she could get on her own, "because what happens to women who have to?"

Not much, she learned.

To date, four applications have been turned down, all with the comment that there is insufficient credit data as reported by the TRW Credit Data Service.

"They say things like thanking me for the application and they would be happy to serve me if my circumstances should change," Mrs. Cizmas said, "But they don't really tell me why."

"I'm going to write and try to find out more."

## 'My stamping foot made my point'

It took "my stamping foot" to convince a credit union there was no need for an ex-husband's name on a credit application," reports Mrs. Marcia Vivian of Birmingham.

Mrs. Vivian, a public health nurse for Oakland County, said she was hit with some orthodontistry expenses and went to the professional credit union where she was a member and had fairly substantial savings.

"They insisted I list the name of my ex-husband," she said, "even though the account is in my name and I have been gainfully employed for 17 years, seven of them as a divorcee."

Mrs. Vivian said "I stamped my foot and carried on and they finally agreed it wasn't necessary."

But by that time she had decided to remove her savings and open an account elsewhere.

"After that," she added "they were very apologetic and very willing to reconsider. Maybe it takes a stamping foot."



# Is there a credit-ability gap?

If you're a woman, it may be more difficult for you to attain the good things of life via America's favorite route—sign now, pay later.

A single woman may need a co-signer to get a loan or open a charge account.

A widow may find all is well if she keeps everything in the name of her late husband, but she may not fare as well if she tries accounts in her own name.

A married woman who has reason to seek credit in her own name finds the way fraught with difficulties.

And the divorcee asking for any sort of credit might as well forget it.

THE SITUATION has brought two developments to the Michigan scene in recent months.

One is a bill in the state legislature providing that "a person shall not discriminate in extending credit or granting a loan on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex or blindness."

The other is establishment of a Feminist Credit Union, designed to consider more favorably the needs of women seeking loans.

The bill has been passed by both House and Senate and currently is back in committee to work out differences in the penalties for denying credit that the two versions provided.

The House bill provides a misdemeanor penalty of up to \$500 and the Senate version is \$1,000. In the House version, there is a possibility of 15 days in jail in violation; the Senate struck down this provision. The two

versions also vary in the amount of damages that may be collected in a civil suit.

"Without real penalties the bill is meaningless," said Esther Shapiro, spokesman for the Michigan Credit Union League with headquarters in Southfield.

Senator Donald Bishop (R-Rochester) headed a Senate committee that removed several penalties.

Of his committee's action, Bishop said he felt he had been "more than fair with women's groups" but believed that in threatening to penalize banks "you're dealing with a public institution and you could do substantial damage to depositors' money."

THE FEMINIST Federal Credit Union, located at 18700 Woodward in Detroit, was established last summer. Joanne Parrant, a director, said the move was taken because "we realized it is difficult for women to get credit and there are humiliating requirements if not definite turn-downs."

The organization, describing itself as a "women's self-help financial center," has two fulltime workers and a committee of volunteers who help keep things going. A volunteer board screens requests for loans.

Decisions are made without regard for sex or marital status, Ms. Parrant said, adding that "we have some male members and have made loans to men," and a co-signer is required only if in other ways the applicant seems a shaky risk.

"We don't automatically consider a divorcee unstable and we realize a woman starting out in business needs an economic base," she said.

"Some of our best loans are to young women just establishing credit."

THE ORGANIZATION currently numbers 12,000 members, Ms. Parrant said, and that figure is going up by about 100 a month.

"Our assets," she added, "are about \$250,000—that's members' savings—and we try to keep loans about \$30,000 behind assets, to keep the money moving and working."

Loans approved, she added, are kept under \$4,000.

"We don't approve all requests for loans, maybe about half," she went on. "We realize some applications are from people testing us."

"And we belong to a credit data service which sometimes indicates a loan should not be granted. But when

that happens, we tell the applicant the reason for the denial."

MRS. SHAPIRO said she is "most unhappy" over the prospects of an end to what she called discriminatory practices in credit granting.

"On the one hand there is the tokenism of the bill and on the other the fact that there is no real penalty," she said.

She added that much evidence shows discrimination against those who have been divorced, and that in recent months complaints from divorced men have reached her office.

"It is equally unfair for them," she contended. "The implication is that if you have a divorce in your background you are unstable."

She said if the bill goes through in its toothless form as amended, she thinks changes may have to come through another route—the way of attrition.

"When enough women complain loudly enough and get high enough, changes happen," she said.

"We'll have to train women in creative complaining. But why should it have to be this way?"

SHE EMPHASIZED, however, that "this does not mean we automatically want credit for women who do not have the backing of earning capacity."

"I hear from married women who are not employed and want credit in their own names—I guess for fulfillment," she added. There's no justification for open credit for everyone."

No one, she stated, should either receive or be denied credit "just because she's a woman."

## Bankers list 3 C's for credit

Granting of credit, says a bank official, is based on three C's—capital, capacity and character—and there's no S for sex in the picture.

Robert B. Kipp, assistant cashier in the credit department of Detroit Bank & Trust, told a Schoolcraft College audience recently that he realizes the young and the retired have problems from a credit standpoint but that there is no differentiation on the basis of sex.

"If you're a good borrower, you're a good borrower, regardless of whether you're male or female," Kipp stated at a session sponsored by Schoolcraft's Women's Continuum Program.

HE CONCEDED that the husband's credit rating is the one kept on record but said it can be a benefit to the wife if she has reason to go for a loan on her own.

"If both have worked over a period of years, there's no problem," he said.

"We'd make you a loan just like that."

"If the woman is on a new job, that's a little different, not because she's a female but because a job of short duration is not enough security."

"But I have the impression women are convinced all creditors are against them, and that's just not true."

IN FACT, Kipp went on, built into the legal system are some very definite benefits that apply only to women.

For example, he said, a widow cannot get less than half her husband's estate, and that "dower interest" in the estate "is a really tough nut to crack."

He also mentioned the case of a loan made to a married woman for purchase of a car. If that loan should be defaulted, he said, the lender can collect from the husband, unless it can be proved that he received no benefit from the loan.

"That's hard to prove," Kipp added, "because it has been held that the husband would indeed benefit—he wouldn't have to drive his wife to work."

There are "not so many cases in this area."

YOUNG PEOPLE have a hard time getting loans because statistics show them to be the worst borrowers, and here women are better off than men, Kipp declared.

Sixty per cent of our losses are on loans to persons between 18 and 25," he said, "but the females have better records than the males so in this age group they have a better chance of getting money."

And loans for retirees constitute "a big problem, especially with inflation and their spending power down."

ROBERT KENYON, of the mortgage department of National Bank of Detroit in Plymouth, agreed the sex of the person applying for a mortgage

is not a factor in determining whether it will be granted.

"Approval of a mortgage depends on a number of factors including age and capacity to repay," he said. "Because pay for women tends to be lower, that is a limiting factor in itself."

A single woman, whether widowed, divorced or never married, is treated as a man would be in applying for a mortgage," Kenyon said. He added that he will not approve a mortgage for more than twice the annual income.

"In the case of a married couple," he went on, "only a fourth of the wife's salary is considered if the couple is in the 20 to 30 age bracket, but more weight is given it for a couple in their 40s."

The difference, of course, is the possibility of pregnancy.

"I don't think I'm doing any couple a favor," Kenyon stated, "if an approval I make lands them in an impossible financial situation."



# New baptist temple opening in Plymouth

A new Baptist church, with close spiritual and financial ties to one of the nation's largest congregations, is projected for downtown Plymouth. It will be located at 670 Church, where Plymouth Methodists held forth until moving to a new church home on North Territorial in February 1972. The building, parking lot and parsonage next door has been purchased for \$91,000 in cash by Ypsilanti businessman Russell Anderson to be the home of the Central Baptist Temple. NEWLY-ARRIVED in town and eager to begin services July 14 is the Rev. Robert Billings Jr., whose father is a nationally-known Baptist leader and whose home church is First Baptist of Hammond, Ind., with a membership roll of more than 28,000. The young minister said he and his wife, Sue, are so far the only members of Central Baptist, "but we'll be visiting and passing out brochures and advertising and we hope to have 100 people in the pews for the first service."

Rev. Billings' background includes a degree from Hyles-Anderson College, opened two years ago in Schererville, Ind., a Chicago suburb, and bearing the names of the Rev. Jack Hyles, pastor of Hammond First Baptist, and Russell Anderson, its principal benefactor. He said the school is the "fastest growing private college in the country" at present. LAUNCHING Central Baptist, Rev. Billings is undaunted by the fact that two large Baptist congregations and at least four smaller ones already are part of the Plymouth church scene. "We're not trying to take members from any other church," he said. "We want those who don't attend church now—our purpose is to get people to heaven, not to our church. "Why, you could even set the church I come from down in Plymouth and still have people not going to church."

He said he and Mrs. Billings had at-

tended services in both the other large Baptist churches and "we would be glad to be members of either one if we were not here to begin a new work."

He was frank to agree that the fact that a good building was available was a primary reason for locating the new church in Plymouth. The purchase was made through Stewart Olford, realtor who took it over from the First United Methodist Church of Plymouth.

REV. BILLINGS, beginning the Plymouth church, is following in the footsteps of a Hyles-Anderson classmate who opened a church in Belleville exactly a year ago.

He said the Rev. John Vaprezan, also operating in a church building purchased by Anderson, now has membership in the Metro Baptist

Temple of Belleville up to 600. "We're sure we can do at least as well—our building is a much larger one," he said.

CENTRAL BAPTIST TEMPLE will be independent of any Baptist organization and fundamentalist, the clergyman said.

"We want to offer something for everyone, and we want to grow," he added. "If a church is not growing, there's something wrong." One thing Rev. Billings hopes to

offer in the near future is a private school that would have the Temple's backing.

During the year since his graduation from Hyles-Anderson with a degree in Christian education, he served as principal of Hammond Baptist High School backed by the Hammond Baptist Church and one of few private schools in the Chicago area.

"I think I have the background and qualifications to do this," he said, "and I really like working with teen-

agers. Of course, I'd hire a principal and staff and serve as administrator—my first responsibility would be as pastor of the church."

REV. BILLINGS, now 28, studied at Tennessee State University, Indiana University and Bob Jones University before earning his degree from Hyles-Anderson.

He spent six years in the U.S. Navy, where he trained as a computer technician, and also is a licensed pilot.

"But I feel God wants me to be a pastor," he said. "There's more money in other kinds of work, but money isn't happiness."

He emphasized that "we want to be good neighbors" in the Plymouth community.

"We're not fighting other churches," he said. "We're fighting the devil."

## Will women's lib touch The Trinity?

Are the widely beloved hymns "Fair-est Lord Jesus," "Faith of Our Fathers" and "Once to Every Man and Nation" in need of revision because of "sex-exclusive language?"

Do the terms "God of our Fathers" and "If a Man is in Christ"—as well as the Nicene Creed really constitute "sexist language?" Why, yes indeed—according to the National Convention Workbook ("Blue Book") of the 2.9 million member United Presbyterian Church. For this denomination's General Assembly voted in 1971 that "the so-called generic usages of masculine nouns, pronouns and adjectives are no longer acceptable in any church documents."

Accordingly, 16 pages of the current Blue Book is devoted to a Women's Lib designed purgation of the denomination's worship book. The cost of this endeavor is estimated at \$110,000—from the nation headquarter's income

which has since 1972 plummeted 25 per cent from \$40 million to a current \$30 million.

"WOULDN'T IT be nice," asks the Presbyterian Journal wistfully, "if the Church didn't have to be the first to jump on every silly band wagon that came along?"

But this Blue Book section manifests that all-consuming itch to be "relevant"—even to women's lib. How the Holy Trinity will emerge from such preposterous foolishness boggles the mind.

Can we imagine reciting (with a straight face): "In the name of the Mother, the Daughter, and Miss (whoops) Ms. Holy Ghost." Or: "In the name of the Elderly Person, the Younger Person and the sexless Holy Spirit."

Independent of such massive liturgical imbecility from a denomination traditionally renowned for scholarship, is the fact that one of Women's Lib's the-

ological vanguards, Prof. Mary Daly of Boston College, apparently feels it falls short.

Dr. Daly delicately described this Presbyterian effort as "half-assed changes."

Professor Daly appeared at the Presbyterian General Assemblies (both the Northern and Southern Presbyterians were in Louisville, simultaneously) to address the concurrent convention of the Religion News-writers Association.

Excerpts from her address: • She corrected St. Paul's ideal of "In Christ there is neither...male or fe-

male" by announcing, "In Christ, there is only male."

• "For women to seek leadership in the Catholic Church is as absurd as a black seeking leadership in the Klu Klux Klan."

• "If you can rape a woman in the street, you can rape the land...Radical Femininity is not concerned with an equal slice of the pie but with power!—and not a phallic thrusting!...We have been drained by the Draculas of patriarchy!...It's a wonderful thing to see a karate class where a woman first learns to make a fist!"

• "God is process—process is what matters. God is a verb. Personality is not a noun. I am a verb..."

• "As for my book 'The Church and the Second Sex,' almost every page has something with which I now disagree." (Dr. Daly wrote this book only seven years ago—a time period she refers to as "light years ago.")

Dr. Daly accepted this column's vehement apology for having described her recently as "a prominent Catholic theologian." (She continues teaching at the Jesuit-owned Boston College and her recent adoption of Radical Feminism as a new religion was not widely announced.)

Dr. Daly affirmed that "there is nothing wrong with changing history to herstory."

But she scoffed when I asked her if a man who had hernias should be expected to refer to them as himnias.

# Rosedale's dentist missionary comes to town for summer

A young man who could be described as living testimony to the resiliency of man is the summer pastor for Rosedale Gardens United Presbyterian Church in Livonia.

Dr. Sam Park, a Korean national who is a dentist, minister and social worker, is no stranger to the congregation. He and his home for troubled boys in South Korea have been a special mission project for local presbyterians.

It was their contribution of \$10,000 that started the home on its way. A chance encounter in Tampa, Fla., with Dr. Richard Dunkelberger, then senior pastor of the Rosedale Gardens church, brought the young minister to the attention of the Rosedale congregation.

COMING TO LIVONIA at Dr. Dunkelberger's invitation, Dr. Park addressed church members about the subject closest to his heart, a facility to help Korean boys who had been placed in a reformatory.

As a youth he had been trapped so traumatically in the battleground of the Korean war that after his university training he determined to aid boys in trouble.

As both dentist and pastor he had frequently visited the local reformatory to counsel the boys and give them medical attention. He had even started a half-way house to help them with their problems re-entering Korean society.

Having spent several years at American universities, Dr. Park was familiar with Father Flannigan's Boys Town. This is what he wanted for Korean boys.

With \$10,000 from the Rosedale church plus contributions from friends and church members in Korea and the U.S. including a donation from the Livonia Rotary club, he was able to purchase seven acres of land outside the town of Kwangju.

"WE FELT OUR first job was to provide vocational training in farming," said Dr. Park. "We have a vineyard, goats and cattle and quickly found that some boys who don't do well in school can become very good farmers."

There are about 20 boys living in Boys Town on a permanent basis and 20 more who remain there for briefer periods of time.

"We wanted to give them their basic needs, food, clothing and shelter," continued Dr. Park. "But we also wanted to counsel them and find them some kind of vocational training."

**Bar mitzvah**

The bar mitzvah of Howard Bernstein, son of Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Bernstein of Livonia, will take place at the 9 a.m. services Saturday, July 6, in the Livonia Jewish Congregation, 31840 W. Seven Mile.

The younger boys who come to them after discharge from the reformatory are sent to the nearby public school and boys between 16 and 20 are sent to a vocational school where they learn such skills as barbering, refrigeration and photography.

"It didn't take us long to decide that the boys did 10 times better in this facility than they did in the half-way house," he said. "Lately we have instituted the cottage concept with a human family for the boys. Oriental boys are extremely family conscious and in this way they can fall into the traditional role of big or little brother."

Continued interest in the Korean Boys Town was maintained by the Rosedale church, and in 1971 the Rev. Arthur K. Beumler, senior associate pastor, was sent by the congregation for a 10-day visit to the facility.

The church also sends clothing to the boys and Dr. Park, now a Ph.D. candidate in social work at the University of Southern California, has visited Rosedale three times in the past five years to keep church members informed.

This summer he will fill in for vacationing pastors, preach, help in the Sunday school and vacation Bible school and work as a counselor. He will also talk to interested groups in the area about his work that grew out of the upheavals of his own childhood.

DR. PARK GREW up in an educated family in North Korea, where his brother was in the anti-communist underground and he was drafted in the North Korean army.

"If I had refused they would have killed my family," said Dr. Park. "As a reluctant soldier I fought against the Americans until they overwhelmed us. Then I ran off and joined some villagers fighting the Korean communists until the Chinese came down from the north and swept past us."

Escaping, he and some villagers managed to get to a coast island and after moving south, island by island, a few of them finally arrived in South Korea in the middle of a battleground.

The boy, then 15, remembers now that "it was the most difficult time in my life — there was no village to go to as the U.S. Air Force had bombed them all and there were napalm fires all around."

"I wandered around there starving and sometimes sleeping in the snow," he added. "But worst of all was the feeling of not belonging anywhere. I had no place to go and no one to protect me."

IT WAS AT THIS POINT that the youth who up to then had thought of Americans in terms of bombs and napalm, became involved with the friendliness of the GI soldiers.

"They identified me as their little brother," he said, "it made all the difference to me. The only drawback was that after I began thinking of one

of them as my father and another as my uncle, they would be transferred. It was almost like a death separation."

He added: "Then I had to find another father image and live with the anxiety that he, too, might leave."

During the three years he was with them, the American soldiers encouraged him to go to school. With a little financial help from them and the Korean laborers he worked among, he started high school.

"I had to live in a cave near Seoul for two years and walk 10 miles a day to high school," he remembers. "It was very hard, but I was valedictorian of my class."

After that Dr. Park went on to college, to dental school and to theology seminary and became caught up in his work in the slums and in the reformatory.

"It was my privilege to go through this tough experience, starving and being lonesome," said Dr. Park,

whose parents were Christians. "I feel God has given me this experience to help me identify with human suffering. I want to use what I have learned for my country."

## Rosedale musician will teach

Mrs. Shirley Harden, director of music for Rosedale Gardens Presbyterian Church in Livonia, will teach handbell music during the 20th annual Church Music Workshop at Michigan State University July 8 to 11.

Some 60 chorimasters and organists from Michigan and nearby states are expected to participate in the sessions in the MSU Kellogg Center for Continuing Education.

The workshop is sponsored by the Michigan Council of Churches and the MSU department of music committee on church-related programs and continuing education service.

Highlights will include a performance by the sacred dance choirs of the First Presbyterian Church of Battle Creek of "Job: a Masque for Dancing," and an organ recital by Huw Lewis, Wales native who recently won a national competition in classical organ.

Other instructors include Dr. Rosella Reimer Duerksen, director of music in the First Presbyterian Church of Iowa City, teaching cantata literature and hymnology, and Dr. Wilbur C. Held of the Ohio State University faculty who will have a class on the organ works of Cesar Frank.

# It's a partnership in Plymouth

Girl Scout Troop 363 of Plymouth has its own gold mine—wealth count-

ed a little in dollars and much more in people.

The Plymouth Newcomers Club has since the club organized two years ago been financial sponsor, says Mrs. Ann Nickoloff, troop leader.

"But more than that, they're 'good as gold' when it comes to resource people," she adds.

The Newcomers donation is \$5 a year, not a lot but that's the way the girls want it Mrs. Nickoloff explains. The first time it was given, it went for record books and files for the newly-formed troop.

More important, says Mrs. Nickoloff, the Newcomers act as a source of qualified consultants for the girls.

"They are a talented group," she says. "The women involved are outgoing individuals interested in helping others."

She adds because the membership is constantly changing the group offers wide diversity and knowledge in many areas, and often serves as a feeder line for the troop to other resource people in the community.

"One scout activity usually leads to another," says Mrs. Nickoloff, "if they can't help us they generally know someone who can."

"They've helped us tremendously in the past year," she continued. "For example, one newcomer, who is a former model and a registered nurse helped the girls receive their good grooming badge."

"In addition to tips on fashion and grooming she was qualified in the health and nutrition areas." A newcomer also helped the girls with their folk dancing badge.

The troop has tried to reciprocate the club's help, says Mrs. Nickoloff, by performing service projects, such as making nametags for club func-

tions and serving as hostesses at the annual Christmas tea.

"It's hard to repay them, because they handle everything so well," says Mrs. Nickoloff.

In an effort to keep the club informed on scouting event two troop representatives spoke recently at the Newcomers luncheon meeting and installation of new officers.

"We accept their donation," says Mrs. Nickoloff, "but we're not always visible and we want the club to know what we're accomplishing."

The working relationship and spirit of cooperation that exists between the scouts and the Newcomers is exactly what the girls wanted, explains Mrs. Nickoloff.

"The girls didn't really want a financial sponsor," she says. "They're quite independent and wanted to handle the financial responsibilities themselves."

The troop currently has 23 girls ranging in age from 13 to 15. Each girl pays 25 cents in troop dues per week.

"Most girls use their allowances or babysitting money for dues," says Mrs. Nickoloff. "That helps to teach them how to operate on a budget, and get the most out of what they have."

Budgeting is a necessary part of planning and Mrs. Nickoloff is very proud of her troop in that department.

"In two years the girls have managed to outfit the troop with a complete supply of camping equipment, and that just goes to show what budgeting can do."

She adds, that this year's Newcomers donation was part of the camping fund.

As far as the Newcomers Club is concerned it's proud to sponsor the scouts.

Outgoing president Mrs. Jerry Allison says it's been the club's practice, as far as she knows to sponsor a scout troop.

She adds, that the extra help the scouts have offered for the clubs' social function has been greatly appreciated.

Much like scouting, the Newcomers help people get in the 'swing of things in the community.' Mrs. Allison suggests that could be the secret to the two groups successful relationship.

"Sure, I made it known that I did not agree with the administration's way of handling the incident," said Bartlo.

"And I still believe that those guilty should have been weeded out and the track season continued even if there were just four kids on the team.

"But in no way, has this incident prompted my actions."

Bartlo added that he felt some of goals had been realized at East.

"When I started in '68, there wasn't even an athletic office. After obtaining this the first thing I had to do was get harmony among the coaching staffs which for some years was missing.

"I also knew our teams had to be outfitted better and I wound up designing the Panther symbol that is sported on our uniforms.

"The one thing I always wanted but never realized was a state championship. We came close in basketball a few years back and wound up third in the state in football two years ago."

School officials have said that they have accepted the resignation and are in the process of interviewing candidates for a successor.

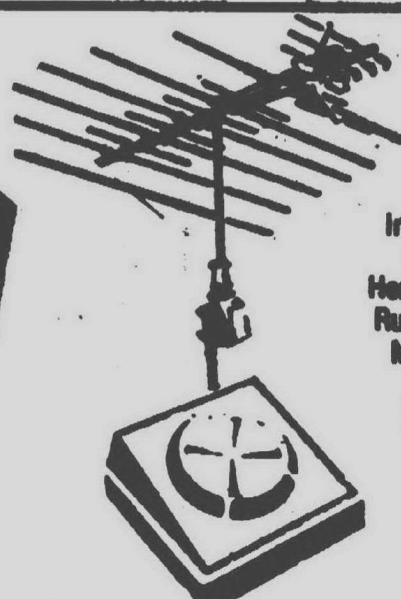
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## Franklin Berry blanks Redford

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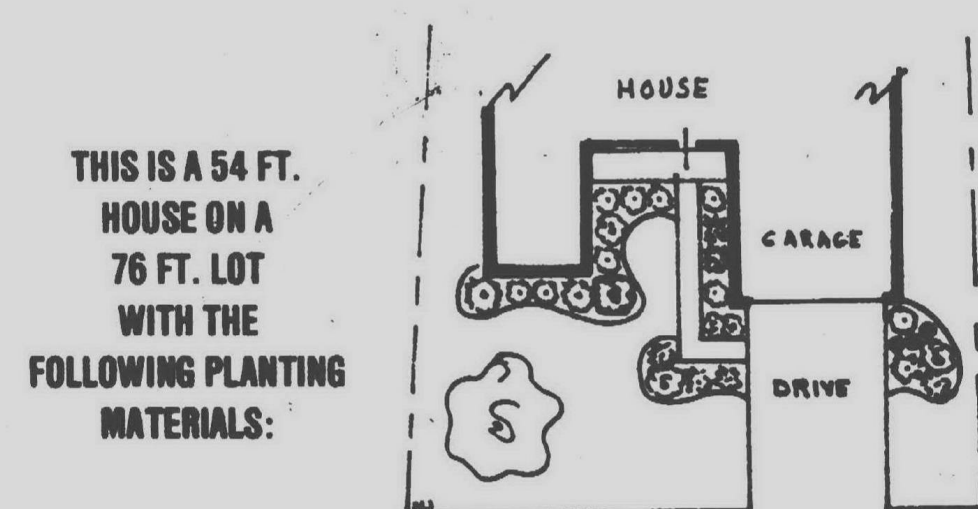
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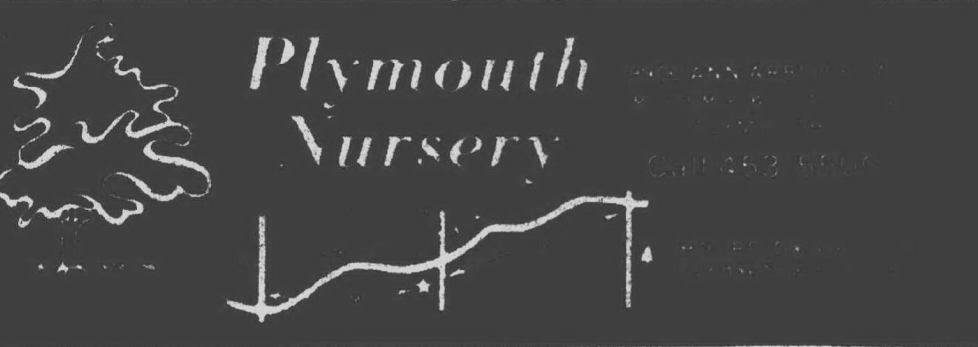
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# In The Pocket

When Bob Hart stepped off the lanes at the American Bowling Congress tournament in Indianapolis several months ago he didn't realize that he was on the threshold of creating a major shakeup among the top teams in the Detroit All-Star Classics.

If you recall, he captained the Goebel team that won the all-events, then shared in the doubles title with Chuck Sumner and took the individual all-events to become one of the few bowlers to claim three ABC titles in one tournament.

For that feat he was chosen to represent the United States in the Tournament of the Americas this month in Miami and now comes another honor.

He has been selected by Stroth to participate in a major shakeup that saw the dropping of Dale Savoy and Bob Crawford, the captain, to return to the five-man team status.

Savoy hasn't lived up to the prom-

ise shown two years ago when he left the pro tour competition, and Crawford, who seemed to have lost some of his scoring power, has turned to another position that doesn't permit time for all-star bowling.

Harry Campbell will take over the Stroth captaincy. Tom Mc Kay, captain of the Goebel team, announced that Leo Sanctamburio will replace Hart in the lineup.

There'll be three new teams in the All-Star Classic when the season opens late in August. At least, there'll be three new sponsors. The teams will be Michigan Ambulance Service, Clark Park Bowl and Ode Tire.

They'll replace Helin Tackle, the Bowling Proprietors and Lodge Lanes, whose members have found places among the other teams.

Since the start of the summer season, the women have been scoring con-

sistently higher than the men and many followers of the game have been wondering why.

Now comes Ann Setlock, former Bowling Queen and instructor at Garden Lanes, with a reason that sounds plausible.

"The women throw a much slower ball than the men," she said, "and as a result they can control it better. In many cases where the men throw a fast ball, it skips and slides on the new material they're using to finish the lanes this year."

Most of the establishments have turned to the new finish and it may be some time before the men find a way to conquer it and get back on the road to high scores.

One of the keenest battles now going on in bowling doesn't concern scores. It is the drive between the men's and women's associations for membership honors.

Thus far the Greater Detroit Bowling Association membership increased by two leagues and 530 men over a year ago. As a result the total membership for the year, with four more weeks to go, has reached 133,163.

In contrast, the Detroit Women's Bowling Association, which used to lag far behind, is now up to 106,000 members and the day may not be far distant when the women will match the men.

It is the same on the National front where the Women's International Bowling Congress membership is nearing the 3.5 million mark.

Polly Cole, who paced the ladies classic at Garden Lanes several weeks ago, proved that victory was no fluke when she took top honors again—this time with a 633. She rolled games of 203, 223 and 207, while Pat Liss had a high game of 226 in a 502 series.

They're still shaking their heads in wonderment down at Westland Bowl—and all because of the unusual series rolled by Jan Himmelstoch in the ladies singles.

Jan, who carries a 159 average, opened with a 178, which was not unusual. Then she followed with a conventional 162. Then something happened. She found the track and closed with a 244 game for 584.

Meanwhile, Bob Schmidt, a 22-year-old, dropped in for a bit of practice. And here's what he did. He opened with a 204 and followed with a 298, leaving up the 1-3 setup after 11 strikes in a row.

He'll be a candidate for one of the all-star leagues before long.
