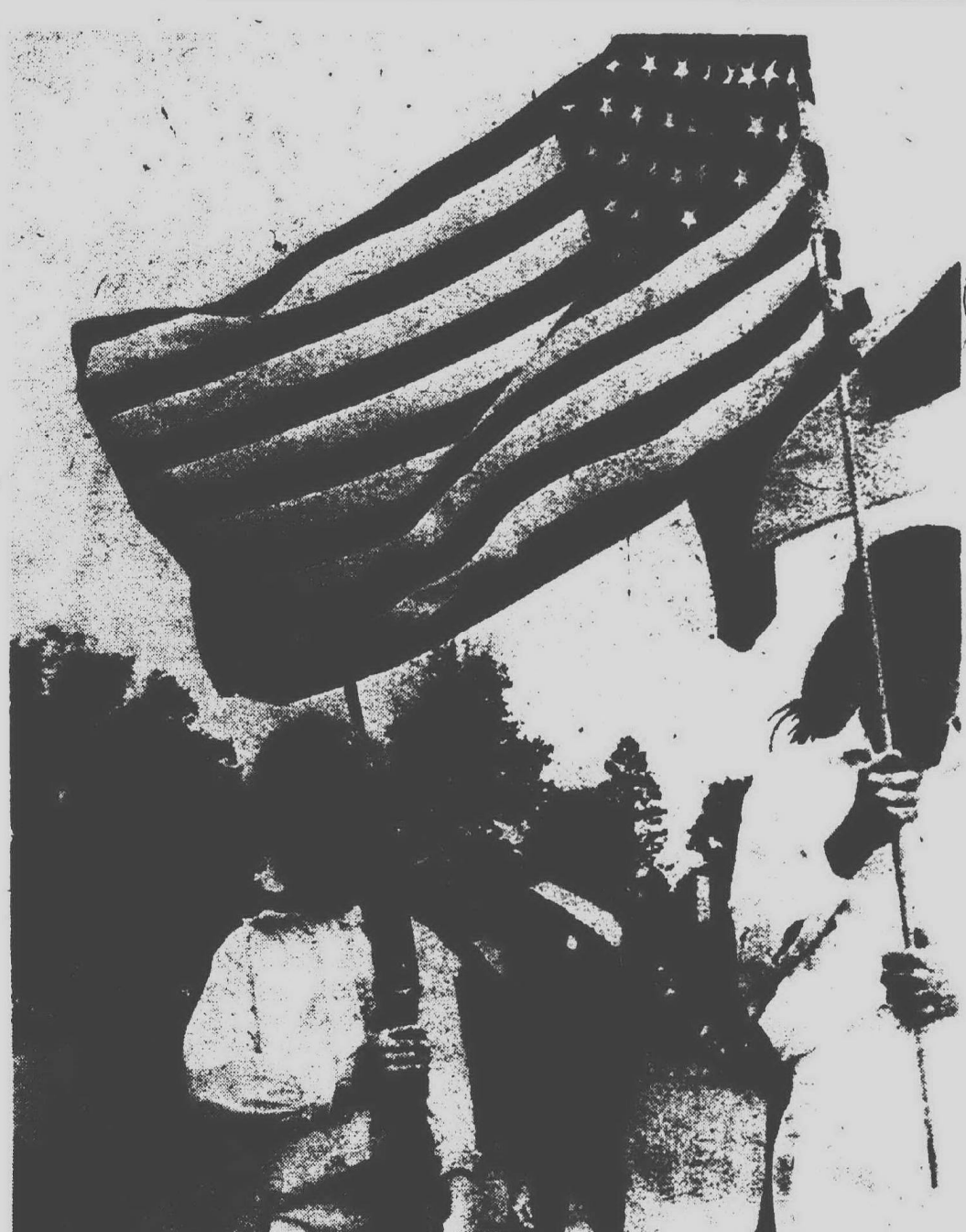

Festivities recall nation's birth

PLYMOUTH—Thousands of parade lovers lined Main Street Thursday to enjoy the annual Fourth of July parade in Plymouth.

Sunny skies and temperatures in the upper 80s lured the huge crowd into the city to watch the marching bands, floats, majorettes, dignitaries and other marching units step out from the Kroger parking lot to march the mile-long route through downtown Plymouth.

The parade, sponsored by the Jaycees, was highlighted by the appearance of many state and local dignitaries.

In keeping with tradition, Gov. William Milliken and British Counsel General James T. Hyslop came to Plymouth again this year to participate in the parade.

Gov. Milliken walked through the city waving and shaking hands with youngsters and adults along the way. Hyslop came to Plymouth to report on the growth of trees the city presented to Plymouth, England, as part of an exchange between the two cities.

Hyslop was accompanied by his wife and daughter. It was the first time his daughter has viewed the Fourth of July parade in Plymouth.

U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch, State Sens. Carl Pursell and William Faust, State Rep. Ray Smit, Wayne County Sheriff William Lucas and many other local officials also were present to add to the excitement.

Three bands from Ontario came to participate in the parade activities. The Lions Club Tri Club Youth Band of Windsor, the Amhurstburg Community Band from Amhurstburg, and the

Chemical Valley Fife and Drum Corp of Sarnia were all on hand to provide the Independence Day music.

In the marching band competition, the Milford High School Band took best band honors.

The Plymouth Community Band, with each band member dressed in a different costume took second place followed by the Clan Mac Rae Pipe Band from Dearborn Heights.

The Salem Rockettes were the best majorettes in the parade. The Canton Chiefettes placed second and the Redford Township Francers were close in the running by taking third place.

Best marching unit in the parade honors went to Boy Scout Troop No. 743. The Farmington Elks, a motorcycle drill team, took second place. The parade's lead unit, the VFW Color Guard, was third.

Among the adult float competition, the St. Peter's Lutheran Evangelist Adult Group was first. Their float was a giant Snoopy made of paper flowers flying the "Spirit of St. Peter's" and pulling a "UNIFY with Plymouth" banner.

The Calvary Baptist Church placed second and the Plymouth Professional and Business Women's Club was third.

In the youth division, the Plymouth Town and Country 4-H Club's float of a farm scene and farm animals took first place honors. The Plymouth, Canton, Northville YMCA Indian Guides were selected for second place and the New Morning School for third place.

The commercial float winner was Moore's A&W Inc. Giant root beer mugs and flowers covered this float with the theme of "home of the burger family." John Smith's of Plymouth took second and Karate Health Spa's Inc. was third.

There was no parade queen competition this year, but the Plymouth Jaycees' prince and princess of Plymouth were present to greet the crowd.

Again this year, in keeping with tradition, John Smith's elephants brought up the rear of the parade which ended at the Middle School East field where the Jaycees annual carnival was in progress.

British bonds renewed

PLYMOUTH—Gillian, the young daughter of James Hyslop, British consul in the Detroit area, will have good reason never to forget her first visit to Plymouth.

Although she has made several trips to America, her visit here on July Fourth was the first she ever made during a celebration of this country's independence from her home land.

She not only witnessed the parade, but actually was a participant as she rode in the official car with Mayor Beverly McAninch and her parents. And she enjoyed every minute of it.

"It was something really different," she said when the long procession ended, "and I shall never forget it."

Now a student at the University of Manchester, she has been with her parents on numerous official visits,

but never before was she made so welcome.

In other years her father participated in the short ceremony in front of the Plymouth rock that sets in the wall between the City Hall and the Dunning Library. On these occasions it became a tradition that he bring a message from the lord mayor of Plymouth, England, telling of the growth of the trees that were presented the visiting delegation on the occasion of Plymouth's centennial in 1967.

This year, for the second time, the reading of the message was not done at the "rock". Instead it was read to the official delegation at a post-parade luncheon.

But, in keeping his end of the tradition, the British consul made his pilgrimage to the rock with his wife and daughter before entering the official car to participate in the major celebration.

The message from Frederick Johnson, lord mayor of Plymouth, read:

"On this day the Stars and Stripes will fly on our city flagstaff, near the four locust trees which are a constant reminder of the close links between our two cities. I am happy to say that all the trees are flourishing, and one in particular is growing into a very fine specimen.

"We hope the bond of friendship existing between our two cities which share an honored name and a common heritage will be renewed and strengthened in the years ahead."

At the conclusion of the visit, the British Consul again stated that of all places he visits he most enjoys his annual pilgrimage here to Plymouth.

And his daughter, standing by with her mother, repeated that she never received a warmer greeting than she did here and that she never will forget her ride in the parade that helped celebrate American independence from her home country.

City asked: 'Reconsider annexation'

PLYMOUTH — The Plymouth City Commission has "received and filed" a letter asking it to reconsider its recent move to annex Plymouth Township.

Soren T. Pedersen asked the commission "to reconsider your prior aspirations."

"I am sure that any regrets of the

loss will be soon forgotten in the future and that gains in the mutual self-respect and renewed cooperation will become earmarked by the benefits to everyone concerned," Pedersen wrote.

He asked that the city withdraw its two petitions filed with the State

Boundary Commission seeking annexation of parts of the township and a third petition seeking annexation of all of the township.

Pedersen, who initially filed to run for township supervisor but then withdrew, is a member of the Township Planning Commission.

Red Cross opens 2 offices to improve area services

The Red Cross has moved its regional office and blood station from Garden City to two new locations in Livonia.

First aid and home nursing training will be located in Hillside Plaza at 15435 Middle Belt. Hours will be 8:45 a.m. to 4:45 p.m.

The blood donor station will be at 32316 Five Mile, between Merriman and Farmington Roads. It's about a mile from the first office.

The blood donor station will be open for volunteers Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2 to 8 p.m.; and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Donors should call 525-3930 for an appointment.

Regional Manager Henry Maurer cited a need for a more centralized location. Although both operations had formerly shared a single office, the dual office arrangement will offer better classroom space for first aid and home nursing training at the Middle Belt location, which will also house the regional office.

M-14 widening tops road work list

Six Wayne County projects, including the widening of M-14, were among 61 in Michigan approved for contracts by the Department of State Highways and Transportation.

M-14 (Ann Arbor Road) is scheduled to be widened from two lanes to five lanes from 2,000 feet west of Sheldon Road in Plymouth, east to 1,300 feet west of Newburgh Rd. in Livonia. The project excludes that portion of M-14 at the I-275 interchange.

Completion date of the project is December 1975 and the lowest of five bidders was Thompson-McCully Co., Belleville, who bid \$2,812,215.

A SECOND project is the construction of a center lane for left turns on Newburgh at Warren Rd., Marquette Street, Cherry Hill Rd., Palmer Rd., and Glenwood Rd. in Westland.

Estimated completion date of the project, which will also include grading, drainage structures, storm sewers, paving and curbs, is December of this year. The low bidder will be announced at a later date, highway officials said.

Another project in Wayne County will be the widening from two to four

lanes of 1.5 miles of M-14 (Plymouth Road) between Whitcomb and Manor Ave. in Detroit. Completion date is July, 1975.

Construction of a left turn lane to carry eastbound US-12 (Michigan Ave.) traffic to northbound Newburgh Rd. in the City of Wayne is also part of the project. Completion date is estimated for August of this year. Lowest of three bidders was John T. White Contractor, Ferndale, with a bid of \$13,875.

WIDENING OF existing right turn flare carrying westbound M-14 (Plymouth Rd.) traffic to northbound Beech-Daly in Redford Township is also slated. Completion date has been set at August of this year. Low bidder was John T. White Contractor.

Also scheduled to be completed by November of this year is the widening and lengthening of a crossover and turn lane on US-24 (Telegraph Rd.) just north of M-14 (Plymouth Rd.) in Redford Township. Crossover carries traffic from southbound US-24 to eastbound M-14. The low bidder was the White contracting firm of Ferndale.

Botsford plans an expansion

FARMINGTON HILLS—Zieger Osteopathic Hospital Inc. will present its plans for an addition to Botsford General Hospital to the Farmington Hills Planning Commission on June 18.

The addition will be attached to the building by a ground level corridor, which will enable the hospital staff to transfer patients from one section to another without taking them up or down stairs or out of doors.

The addition will be used for X-Ray facilities, educational and office space for the medical director and department heads, and professional offices for the staff physicians.

The structure would be three stories high.

THE HOSPITAL has also recently acquired an undeveloped piece of land adjacent to the hospital which it will use to widen the access to Grand River, and for additional parking, if necessary.

This additional property, which they refer to as the Klein property, is adjacent to the hospital and parallel to Grand River.

In a report submitted to the planning commission, Allen Zieger, president of Zieger Osteopathic Hospital, Inc. stated that the hospital needs the additional space for its expanding educational programs.

The report said that the hospital has between 24-26 interns, and the same number of residents a year.

They also have a program for clinical clerks, students from various universities who are at the hospital for periods of six or seven weeks per group.

Over 50 per cent of the new building would be related to these educational facilities according to the report submitted.

IT ALSO stated that the extent to which the annex could be connected with utilities, heat, etc. has not yet been determined.

According to the report the location would tend to keep the traffic away from the side streets and improve the traffic flow in the area as a result of the proposed changes in the access roadway to Grand River.

Madonna, RU, Livonia awarded juvenile funds

Three western Wayne County projects are among 31 that have been allocated funds by county commissioners to prevent or reduce juvenile delinquency and youth crime.

Madonna College received a continuation grant of \$79,739 from the U.S. Health, Education and Welfare Department. According to County Commissioner Mary Dumas (R-Livonia), the college participates in a remedial teaching and counseling program for students in the Juvenile Facility Network center in Inkster.

Livonia School District's "Project Early" will receive a grant of \$76,499 from the federal Law Enforcement Assistance Administration.

"The grant will be used to provide task-oriented alternative opportunities for junior high youngsters who have previously been identified as delinquent-prone through 'Project Find,'" Mrs. Dumas said.

Redford Union School District got renewal funds of \$124,400 for "ACE" — the Alternative Center for Education. It will provide employment opportunities for 34 young people and "alternative education programs" for 150 persons in the 12-17 age bracket.

Altogether, the county board allocated \$2.7 million in projects under the Juvenile Facilities Network program, which won a 1974 "county achievement award" from the National Association of Counties.

Commissioner Tom F. Taylor (D-Westland), chairman of the board's human resources committee, said, however, that "many worth while proposals could not be funded because of a cutback" in LEAA funds. "However, additional projects have been recommended for consideration in the event more money becomes available."

Last year, Wayne County received \$3.5 million in LEAA funds.

Supermarket loses appeal on dividends

The Michigan Supreme Court has unanimously affirmed decisions of the trial court and the Court of Appeals in a case involving a dispute over distribution of profits to shareholders.

Allied Supermarkets was one of numerous stockholders in Grocers Dairy Co. that challenged the method of distributing profits to shareholders based on a proportion of business each shareholder did with Grocers Dairy.

Allied claimed Grocers Dairy should have distributed profits or dividends on a pro rata basis.

The Supreme Court, in an opinion written by Justice Thomas G. Kavanagh, found a corporation need not pay out its dividends only on a pro rata basis if another basis has been adopted by unanimous consent of the stockholders.

2nd District GOP to elect delegates

Republican precinct delegates in the Wayne County portion of the 2nd Congressional District will convene Aug. 14 at Schoolcraft College to elect delegates and alternates to the 1974 GOP state convention to be held Aug. 24 in Cobo Hall.

The precinct delegates, who will be chosen in the Aug. 6 primary, represent Republicans in the City of Plymouth, Plymouth Township, the Wayne County portion of the City of Northville, Northville Township, and all of Livonia except precincts 36 C&D, which are in the 15th Congressional District.

The convention is open to the public.

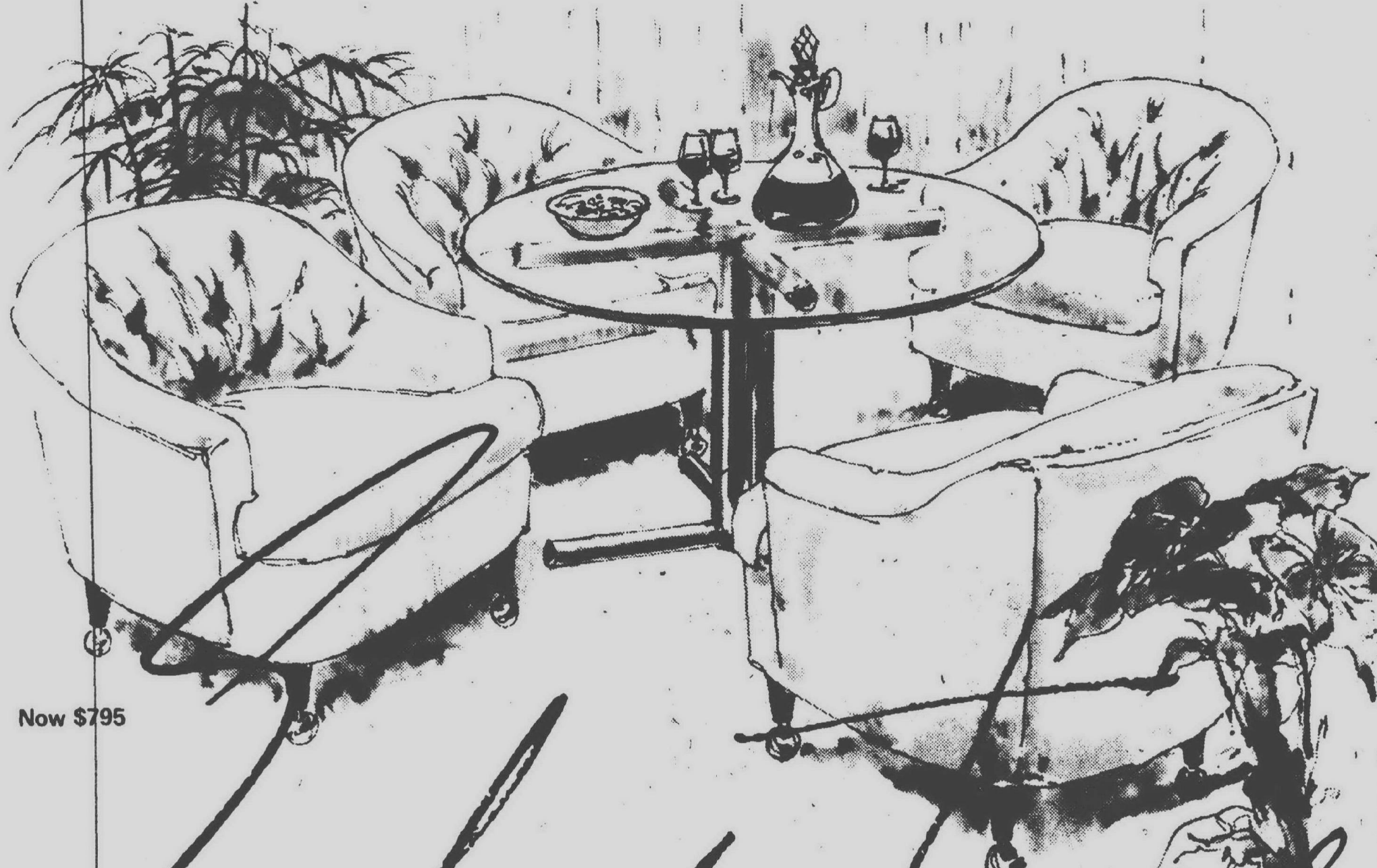

PLYMOUTH—Do you remember when hot dogs were a dime and the canopy dance was the biggest event in town?

Or how you laughed and cheered as your favorite fireman put forth his last ounce of strength to win the annual tug-of-war contest?

How many memories does that bring back? "Dearie, Dearie, do you remember when?" bring back?

Nostalgia will fill the air around Old Village on Saturday, July 20, from 10 a.m. until midnight when the merchants of the Old Village Association present their annual "Dearie Day" in memory of days when prices were low, and the canopy dance was the biggest event of the season.

Kicking off the festivities will be a parade starting at Point Park and proceeding south down Starkweather Street, featuring antique cars, clowns, music, and the Keystone Cops.

Square dances, a flea market and contests for the largest flower made and the best decorated bicycle will fill the streets as sidewalk sales will offer a relief from today's inflation.

Milton Orr, owner of Bill's Market, said that the festival brings people together with the profits going back into the area.

"Last year, I sold 2,000 hot dogs, each for 15 cents. It's a good way to meet people and the profits go back into the area like the beautification of Point Park," said Orr.

Jr. football starting registration

PLYMOUTH — The Plymouth Community Junior Football League will hold registration for the upcoming season starting tonight (Monday).

The registration will be held for football players and cheerleaders Monday through Thursday from 6 to 8:30 p.m. at the refreshment stand on the athletic field behind Plymouth - Canton High School.

Players and cheerleaders must be between nine and 12 years old. (No one older than 12 by Sept. 1 can be accepted.)

Proof of age and a parent or guardian must be brought to registration.

The registration fee for players is \$15 and for cheerleaders it's \$10.

"The profits from the first festival went for improvement of the lighting in the area and then toward the beautification of Point Park. Any profits from the dance or other events will go towards beautifying the square behind the stores, installing benches, and an old fashioned gazebo," said Mrs. Hann.

The day's festivities will center in the area of Spring, Starkweather, Liberty, and Mill streets, bringing a little nostalgia into the '70s.

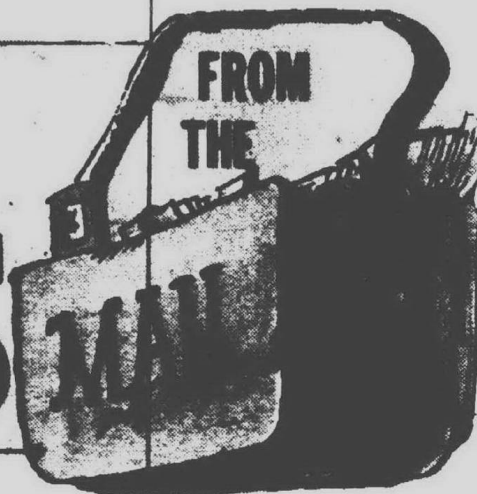


School speed limit bill OK'd

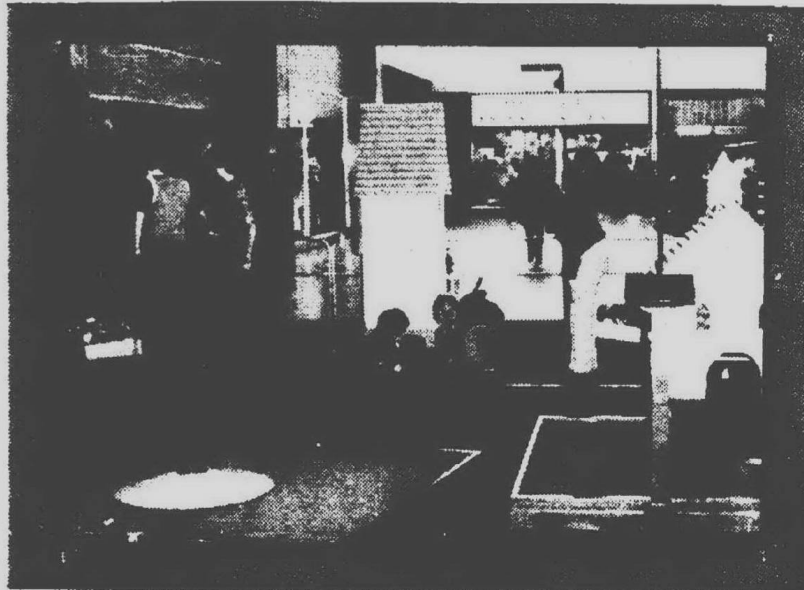

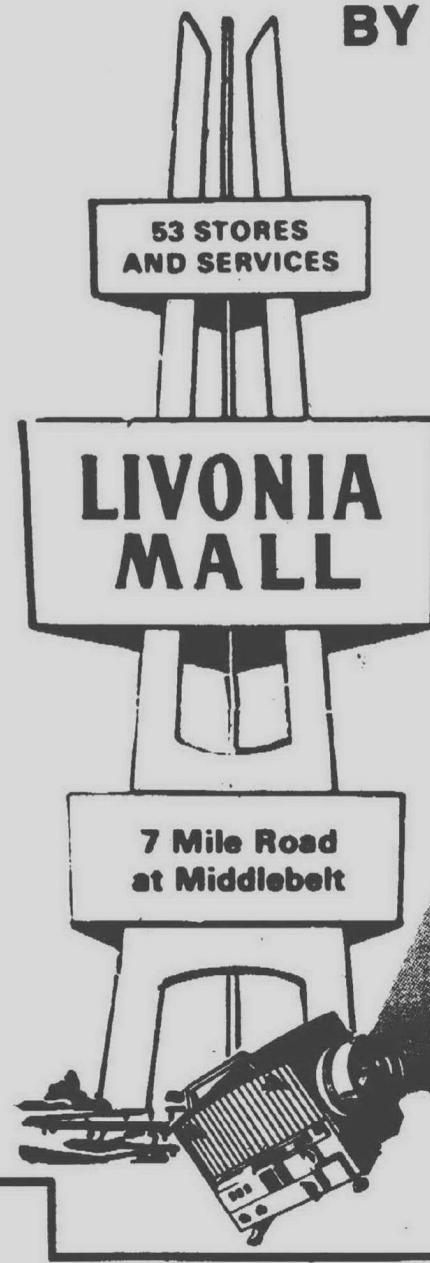

Canton professor will study artwork in Rome

A philosopher of ancient Rome once said, "Art is long; life is brief."

Although the philosopher is long gone and forgotten, the validity of what he said still rings true. And a Canton professor will leave in mid-July to lead a University of Windsor program which will allow students to observe and study the art works of ancient and contemporary Rome.

Prof. Joseph DeLauro of Canton, who heads up the Fine Arts Department at U-W, has been instrumental in setting up the program which will take nine students and another professor to Rome for six weeks to plunge into the cultural labyrinth of history's greatest civilization.

"I think that this is absolutely the best way to learn," said DeLauro of the credit program which will take the students to both Rome and Florence to study architecture, painting and opera.

"You can look at pictures in a book, but you can't move a monument or a fountain or a church," he said.

DeLauro said that the program was being tried on an experimental basis

and that it would be evaluated upon the return of the participants.

"While Rome has a longer tradition in the arts than almost anywhere, we will certainly have to examine the facilities and the people while there and then, when we come back, talk to the students to see what they got out of it and take a look at the economics of the situation," he said.

DeLauro said that the students will stay in a small liberal arts college near the Vatican. He said that the proximity to the great works of art will serve as an inspiration to the students.

"When you see the real thing, then, as an artist, you will have something to say about the experience that the work of art has on you. It becomes a two-way street. You realize what has been done and therefore what can be done."

DeLauro is a seven-year resident of Canton. Although he says he has never kept track, he believes that he has sculptured nearly 100 statues including an 11-foot model of Our Lady of Fatima which he recently completed for Madonna College in Livonia.

He grew up during the depression in Connecticut and founded his department at U-W in 1960.

"When I was growing up in Connecticut, the economic climate was such that all my friends thought I was crazy for going into the arts. They all thought I was going to end up living in a garret. But I was influenced by my father who was a cabinet maker and very fond of the arts," DeLauro said.

DeLauro, who is a candidate for Canton Township trustee, has previously been to Italy five times.

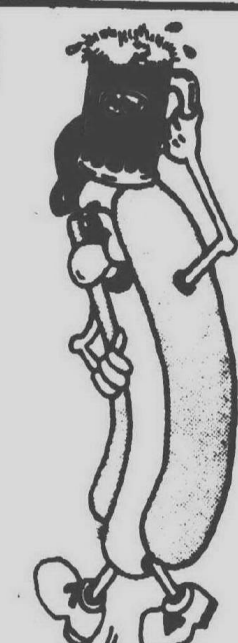

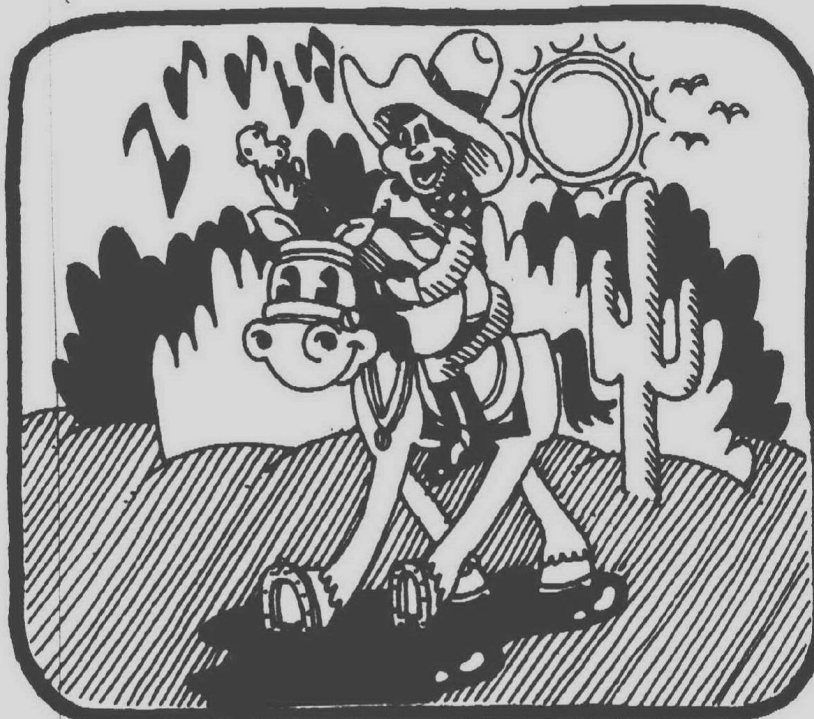

Symphony announces family plan

An expanded family membership program is the goal of the new Plymouth Symphony Society president, Jane Moehle.

"We hope to raise \$7,000 through family memberships this August and September, an increase of \$2,000 over last year," said Mrs. Moehle who took office recently.

The family memberships continue at \$15 to \$100 and include one or more tickets to each of the symphony's regular concerts. The goal, if achieved, would supply nearly one-third of the society's \$22,500 annual budget.

"We are going to make an effort to reach the new people in our growing community, especially in Canton Township," Mrs. Moehle said.

She rejoined the symphony board after serving on it from 1960-64. She served on the Schoolcraft College board more than 10 years (1961-71), the last three as chairman.

Other officers include Norman Ruehr, reelected vice president; Charles Wells, secretary; and Ann Taylor, reelected treasurer.

Beginning new terms on the board of directors are Donald Morelock of the Schoolcraft College music faculty; Melissa Roe, retired piano teacher and senior citizen representative; Jan Gerish, president of the Symphony League; Ralph Atchley; and Annette Heindryckx. Mrs. Heindryckx will be membership committee chairperson.

Major plum for SEMCOG: Southfield

Southfield City Council voted unanimously recently to join the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

SEMCOG is a voluntary association of governments composed of elected officials from 96 communities in six counties.

Its principal function is to develop and coordinate regionwide planning for transportation, land use, recreation and open space, water supply, sewage disposal, storm drainage, criminal justice, manpower development and housing.

"The City of Southfield is among the most vital and important communities in the region," said Homer Case, SEMCOG chairman.

"Their participation in the forum of regional affairs will benefit that city as well as the entire region," he said.

With a population of more than 76,000, Southfield will become the fifth largest member-city.

Detroit (1.5 million), Livonia (109,000), Ann Arbor (103,000), and Pontiac (84,600) are the top four cities in SEMCOG.

According to Case, Southfield's annual dues to SEMCOG will be \$3,050, which will be rebated back to Oakland County, also a member of SEMCOG.

Case said that Southfield's action is consistent with his stated goal to increase council membership in 1974.

Vocational teachers are needed

Madonna College has been approved by the Michigan Department of Education to vocationally certify people to teach health fields and trade and industry subjects, Sister M. Danatha, Madonna president announced.

The Madonna program in learning disabilities was also approved for certification.

"Technically proficient people may now earn certification and/or a college degree so they may teach in the burgeoning vocational programs in comprehensive high schools and technical schools," Sr. Danatha said.

Degreed persons with work experience may already qualify for temporary authorization to teach in vocational programs, she noted.

"It is increasingly evident that the thrust in education is toward making graduates employable," she stated, "and hundreds of new technically proficient and certified teachers will be required to meet the demand."

Rouge cleanup is \$50,000 kids' project

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners has authorized \$50,000 for a joint program to hire Detroit teenagers for cleaning the Rouge River this summer.

The money will pay for supervision and transportation of Detroit youngsters from the In-School Neighborhood Youth Corps (ISNYC), part of the Detroit public school system, who will clear debris from the river.

Salaries for the youngsters will be paid with federal funds under the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act. The program is tentati-

vely scheduled to begin July 15 and run six weeks. Some 280 teen-agers will take part.

Last year the commissioners allocated \$15,000 for the program, which covered transportation and supervision for more than 100 youngsters for five weeks.

THE YOUTHS will be transported to and from the yet-undetermined work sites by the County Drain Commissioner's Office, which also will furnish equipment and supervisory personnel.

Participants will earn \$2 per hour

and will be limited to 40 hours per week and a maximum of 234 hours for the summer.

The program was established to benefit Detroit families considered impoverished under U.S. Department of Labor guidelines. To qualify, a family of five must have a net income below \$5,290 for the past year.

PARTICIPANTS have already been selected through ISNYC procedures. The program's project director, Robert Shannon, said screening of applicants began in January.

Southfield educator on SEMTA

The General Assembly of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) has appointed two members to the board of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

Serving three-year SEMTA board terms beginning July 1 will be Mrs. Mattie J. Myers and Allen A. Hyman.

A resident of Detroit, Mrs. Myers is president of Martin Luther King Homes, Inc.

Hyman is assistant to the president of Wayne State University, Detroit. He lives in the city of Southfield, in Oakland County.

Mrs. Myers was reappointed to the SEMTA board. She has been a board member since 1967 when she was appointed by Gov. Romney and she has served her current term as a vice chairwoman.

Hyman replaced David F. Breck, who did not seek reappointment. Hyman joined Wayne State University's political science department in 1968, later becoming director of the university's office of grants and contracts.

Prior to WSU, Hyman was program director at the University of Michigan's Institute for Social Research and before that he worked on the staff of Metropolitan Fund, Inc., Detroit.

For some 12 years Hyman also held various administrative positions with the city of Philadelphia, Pa. He holds a PhD in political science from the University of Pennsylvania.

SEMTA is a single-purpose operating authority providing public transportation throughout Southeast Michigan. It was established by the state in 1967.

The act authorizes SEMCOG to appoint six of the nine members of SEMTA's board. The governor of Michigan appoints the remaining three. All serve staggered three-year terms.

SEMTA's board members must be residents of the six-county region served by the SEMTA. This includes Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Washtenaw and Wayne counties.

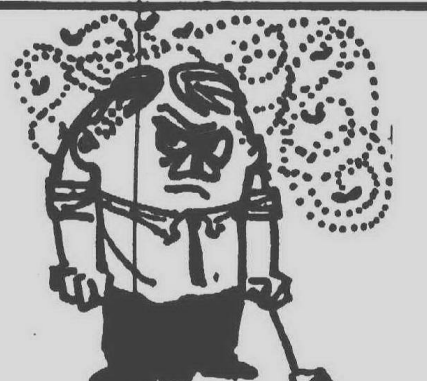
The state also requires that SEMCOG review and comment on SEMTA's budget and public transportation programs.

Warmup for swimmers 12 and under is from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. and for 13 and over swimmers at approximately noon. There is no entry fee collected.



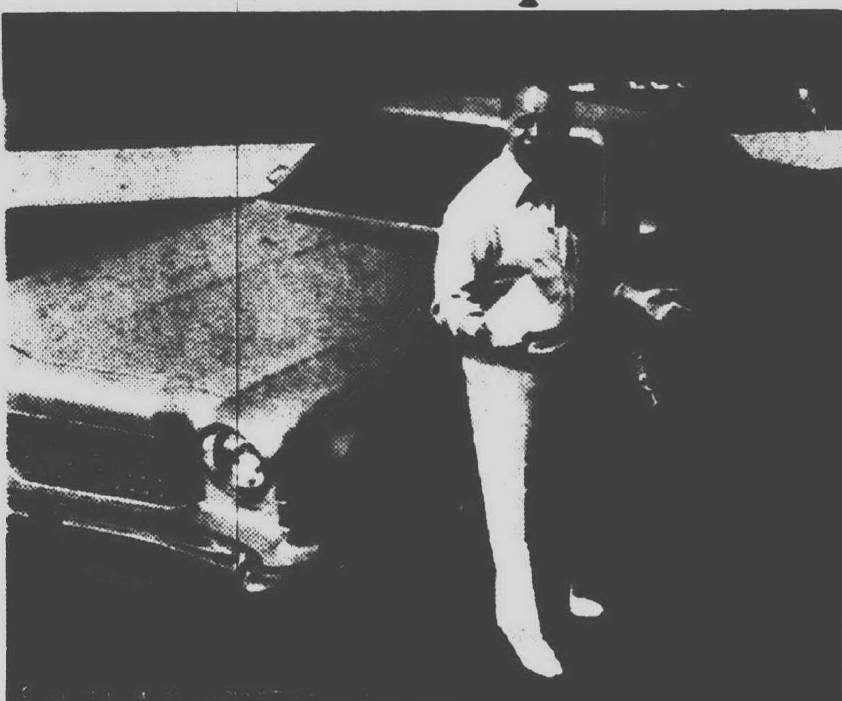

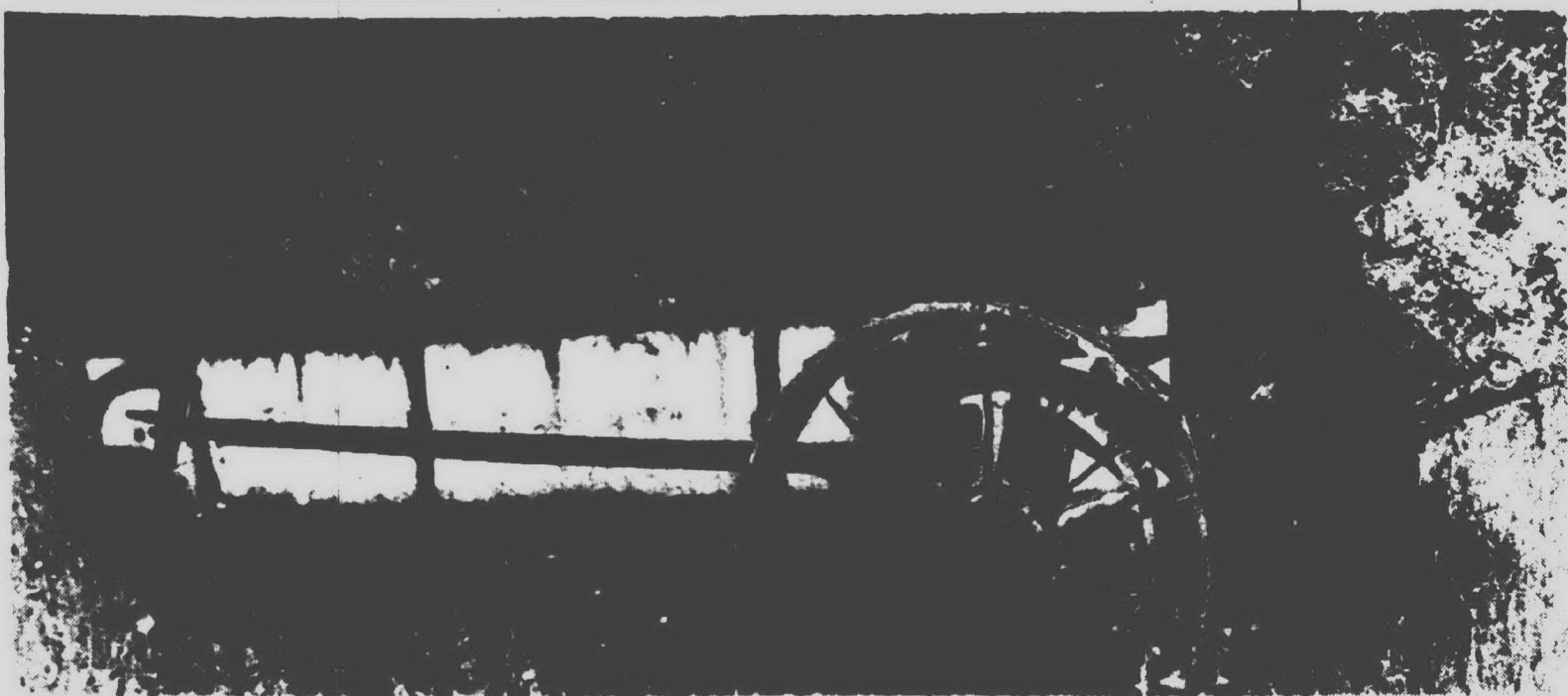

There's always something unusual never mentioned in the colorful brochures that will be a constant reminder—such as the fish ringing the bell on the St. Clair River to let the anglers know it was coming to dinner or a fellow losing his pants in a far away place.

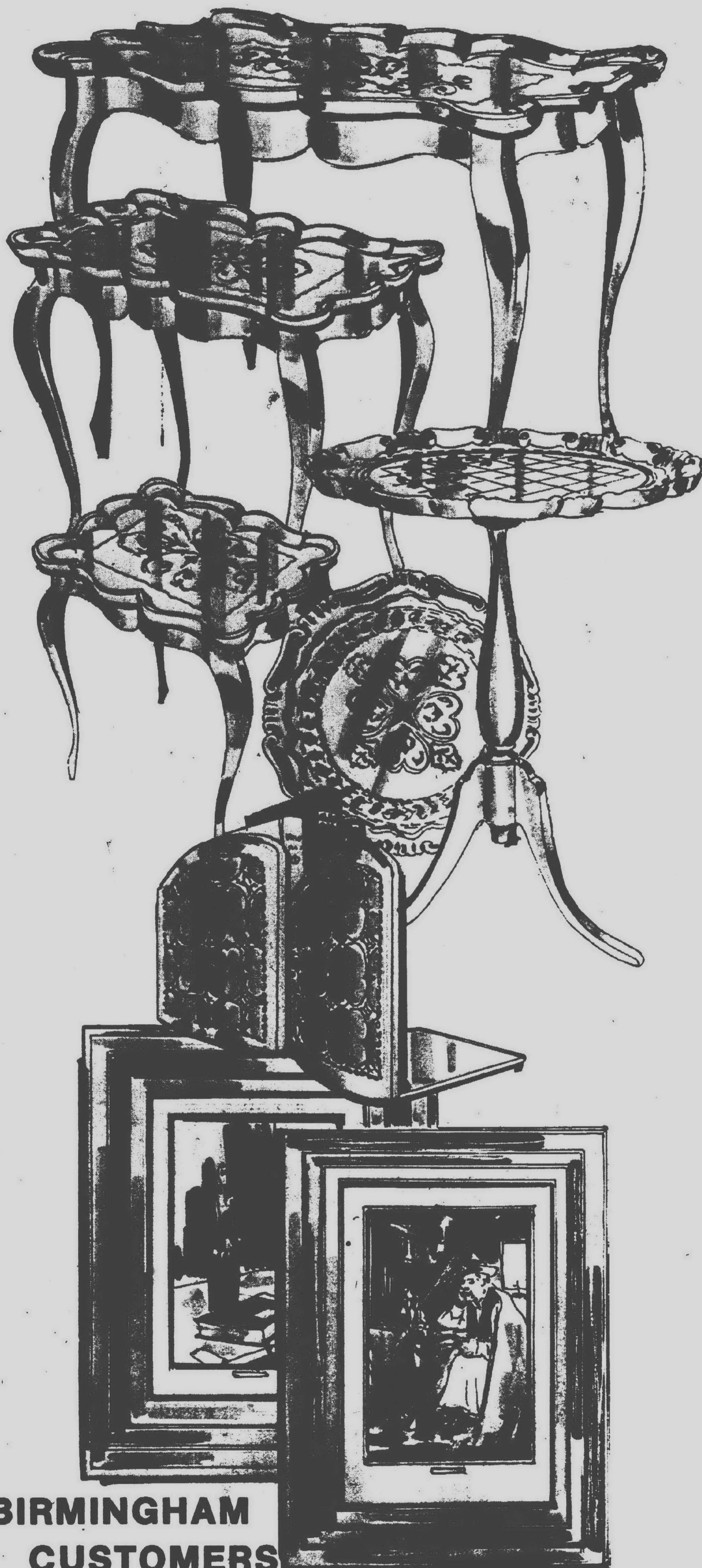

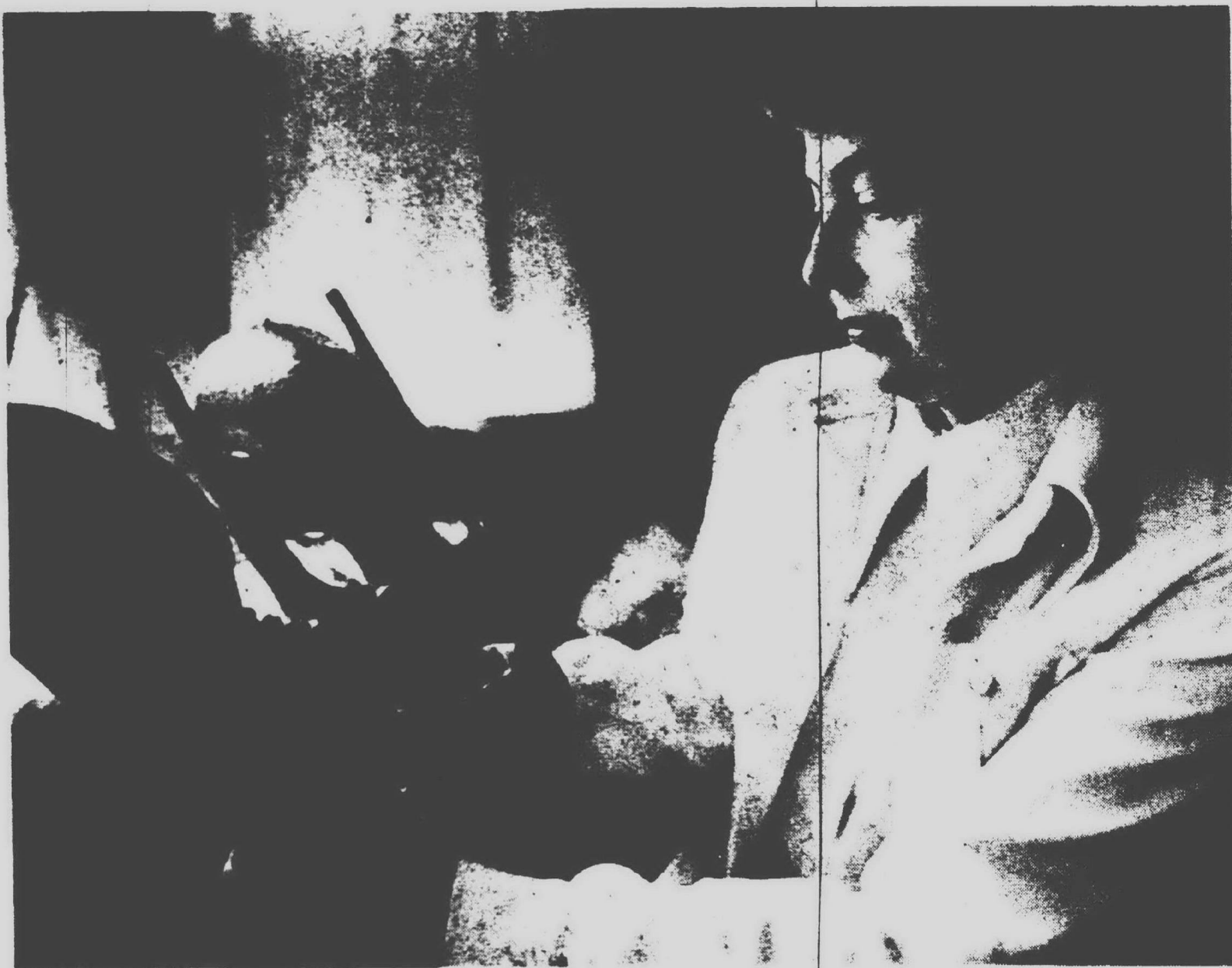

Here's how you can spend an interesting year

Anyone who has been fretting about what to do with all the relatives dropping in during the summer will sympathize with the problem of Mrs. James O'Day, 1325 Park Place, Plymouth.

She has 30 foreign students to place in area homes by August. As representative for Youth for Understanding, an organization that every year brings hundreds of foreign students to this country under the sponsorship of the U.S. State Department, Mrs. O'Day is looking for families ready to try a new experience.

The students who come for the school year are between 14 and 18 and are selected by a committee of their countrymen on the basis of scholarship, personality, interests and average grades.

"I wasn't sure I wanted a stranger in my house for almost a whole year," admitted Mrs. O'Day. "But my kids wore me down. Later I found I enjoyed it so much that I became completely involved with Youth for Understanding."

MRS. O'DAY HAS four children so it was impossible for her foreign stu-

dent to have a room of her own. "We all managed," she said. "All the children enjoyed it, even our eight-year-old."

"We got more out of the experience than we put in," she explained. "We have to supply food, a place to sleep and a portion of our time. In return we have the chance to know a person from another culture. We learn their customs, history and sometimes their recipes."

Another dividend as far as the O'Days are concerned is the opportunity to visit new friends in foreign countries.

"We just came back from a delightful visit with the German family of Gabi Rode, who stayed with us," said Mrs. O'Day. "My daughter, Peggy will be with them for the summer. You seem to have friends all over the world this way."

Next summer their son, Phil, will travel to the Philippines to stay with Dennis Casaje, who has been their student guest this year.

"These young students can be valuable visitors for the whole community," said Mrs. O'Day. "Schools can invite them in to tell the children

about their country — they usually come with a native costume and pictures. Service organizations can also invite them to give a presentation."

MR. AND MRS. HENRY MURAWSKI of Redford Township found that having a foreign student lives with them was "a very wonderful experience, and it was sad when we had to let her go."

Mai-tess Lacson came to them from the Philippines and attended Redford Union High School. The Murawskis called her Marty.

"If you are willing to work with someone from another culture it is a terrific experience," said Mrs. Murawski, who have a girl come to them from Switzerland this summer.

THE ARTHUR DESCH family of Plymouth has had three foreign students living in their home over the last few years. One was from the Philippines, the others from Brazil and Mexico.

Mrs. Desch, who likes to cook in many languages, has found the metric system has made a problem in the attempts to cook on the part of her current guest, Sonia Iniguez. She learned to measure metrically and find it difficult to work with our system of weights and measures.

"YOU HAVE TO have a family capable of living with other people and adjusting with the tide," said Mrs. Desch.

"At first you treat them like visitors but before long they really become a part of your family," she said. "The whole thing is very worthwhile. We were able to take Sonia to Washington, D.C., Niagara Falls and the Upper Peninsula while she was here."

MRS. MARILYN DAVIS of Livonia, took in a foreign student at the behest of her son, Mark. From her own experience as a foreign student with a family in France, she feels the experience can be a broadening one.

"I found I had to learn to get along and understand the motivation behind how and why they did things," she said. "Students visits are certainly a better way for building friendships than war. My French father had been a prisoner of war for four and a half years during World War II and he hated the Germans."

rs. Catherine Thoburn of Plymouth finds that although there have been ups and downs in the situation that "in the long run it works splendidly."

When Rufo Gutierrez came to them from Chilapa, Mexico, unlike most of the visiting students, he could speak very little English.

"I contacted Carmelo Krespo, a teacher of Spanish at Plymouth-Salem High School and he was most helpful," she said. "Another teacher, Antonio Lonigro, also helped and became his friend and mentor."

MRS. THOBURN POINTED out that Mexico has a very different social structure from that in the U.S., a large division between the haves and havenots. She laughed as she said, "the idea of doing housework was very new to Rufo."

"But he entered into it with great willingness even though such things as shoveling snow were totally alien to him," she said. "Now he makes his bed and takes his turn at the dishes."

She mentioned the unspoken fears prospective parents might have about their foreign "offspring."

"You worry about being responsible," she said. "You ask yourself how will I entertain him and how will he get along with my family."

But it turned out that her fears were unfounded. Once school started the student develops his own friends. Gutierrez, for example will soon take back to Mexico with him Mac Hamlin, a fellow student at Plymouth-Salem.

The family of John Armbruster, president of the Lola Valley Kiwanis club in Redford Township, is "all excited about having a boy come to their Livonia home from France this August."

"I was a little worried at first that I would have to be a model mother,"

said Mrs. Armbruster. "But Mrs. Wesley Orr of Farmington, who works in the program, told me I should treat him like a member of the family."

Mrs. O'Day said few families can expect the luck of one American student, whose family hosted a foreign visitor. The foreign student's family sent a roundtrip plane ticket so the American student could visit them in Colombia, South America.

Even so, there are many positive aspects about having foreign students in your home, she said.

"The bad part is taking them to the airport to send them home," she added. "Everyone is sad and weepy. It is unbelievable how they become part of the family."

Friends trace prints

This quilt extends many hands

Mrs. Grace Blazo of Redford Township has her friends and relatives well in hand when she looks at the quilt she recently finished making.

Every square on the full-sized coverlet has the handprint of someone important in her life. And each handprint is further identified with the person's name in embroidery and a stitchery picture or two.

There's her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Beregi, Redford residents 27 years.

"My mother loves to cook and her favorite flowers are forget-me-nots," Mrs. Blazo said. "So I put pots and pans and some flowers beside the print of her hand."

"And for my dad—he's 86 now—his favorite rocking chair."

MRS. BLAZO'S HUSBAND, Frank, has a fishing pole and line in his square, and for her brother, Steve Berge, there's a golf club.

A beekeeper brother-in-law has honeybees buzzing in his square, a sister-in-law who teaches Sunday School is identified by a church and there's a silo and wheat and corn for a friend who lives on a farm.

Represented on the quilt are mostly friends and relatives from this area, but Mrs. Blazo wrote to California to get one friend to send a handprint.

"And one of our friends traced his hand and said he wanted it on the quilt in dollar-bill green," she said.

"So I identified him with a hybrid money tree and some dollar signs."

She also points out a square with an old Studebaker for a friend who is an antique car buff, and one with a smile and the words "Happy Talk" because the friend depicted there "always makes me laugh."

THIS CREATIVE quilt-maker found part of her idea in a magazine a couple of years ago. That quilt, however, had just the handprints, and she added the extra touches.

She found she learned a lot about birds, flowers and animals in working out all the squares.

"I knew what I wanted for some of the people on the quilt," she said, "but I had to look up in books to figure out how to draw them."

What's in her own square? "A knife and fork because I love to eat," she laughed, "and watermelon because it's my favorite food."

MRS. BLAZO has made more than a dozen quilts, using a variety of methods—applique, cross-stitch and piecing. This is the first of the handprint design.

She also does needlepoint, grows flowers and vegetables and has worked out an unusual type of gift suitable to many occasions.

The latter is a bouquet with dimes in the center and plastic flowers and dollar bills surrounding it.

The dimes are wrapped separately in plastic wrap, and the surrounding

green "foliage" can contain as many bills as you want, she points out.

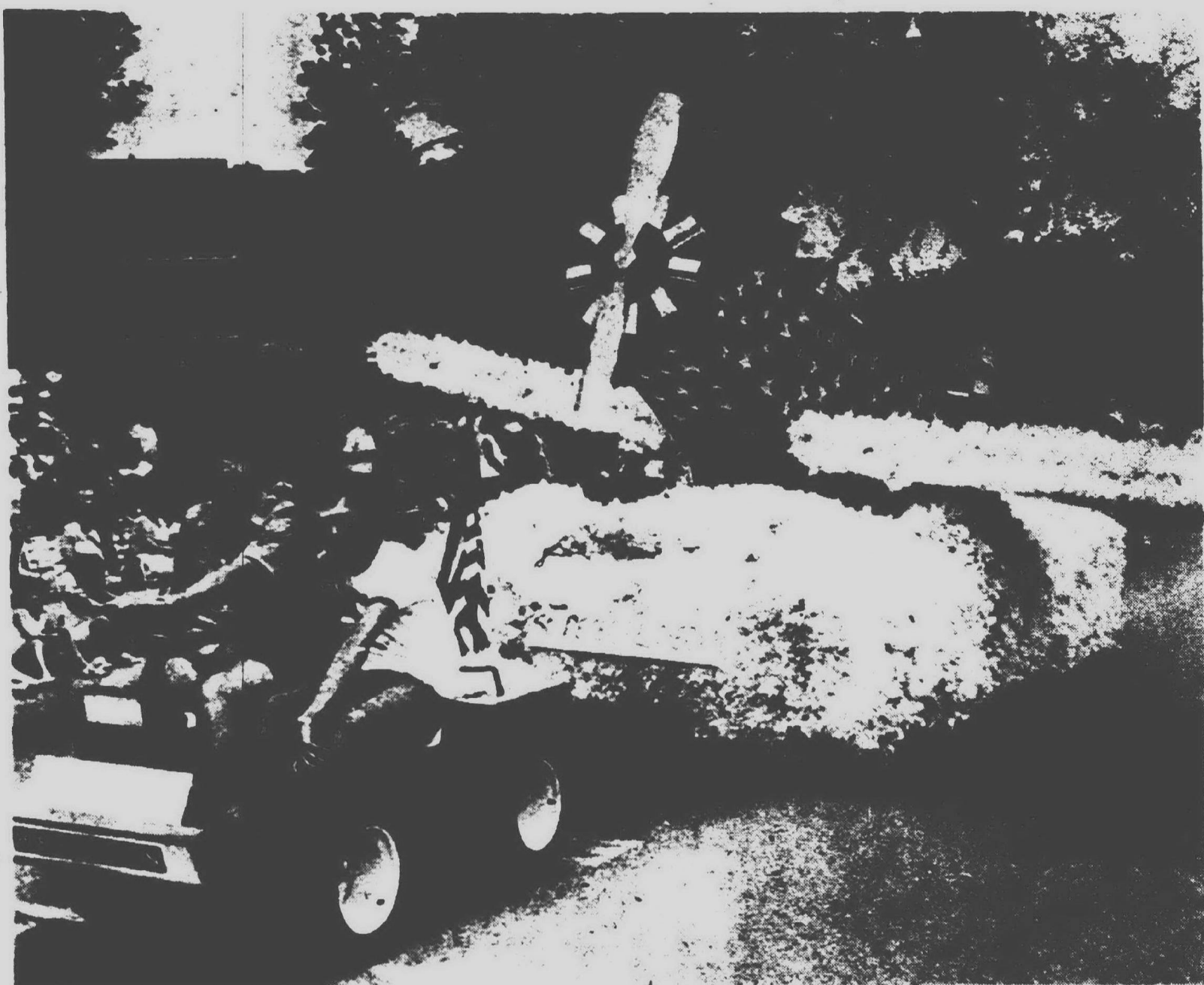
"I've made them for shower presents and the girls sometimes carry them for the rehearsal dinner," Mrs. Blazo said, "and they also make good

anniversary presents. I used gold ribbons on one for my parents' 50th anniversary party."

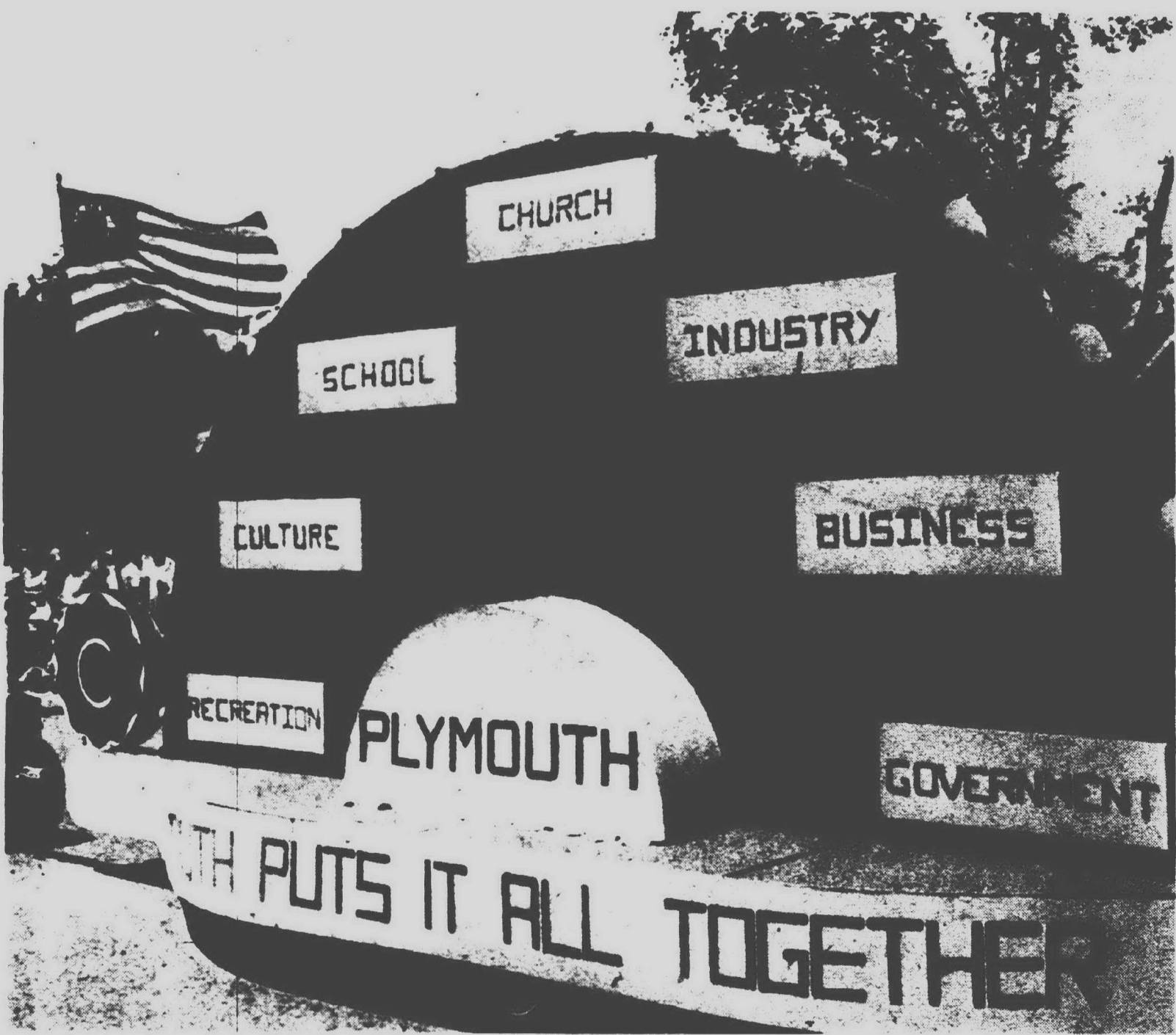
The bouquets, she added "really take over the conversation at a party."

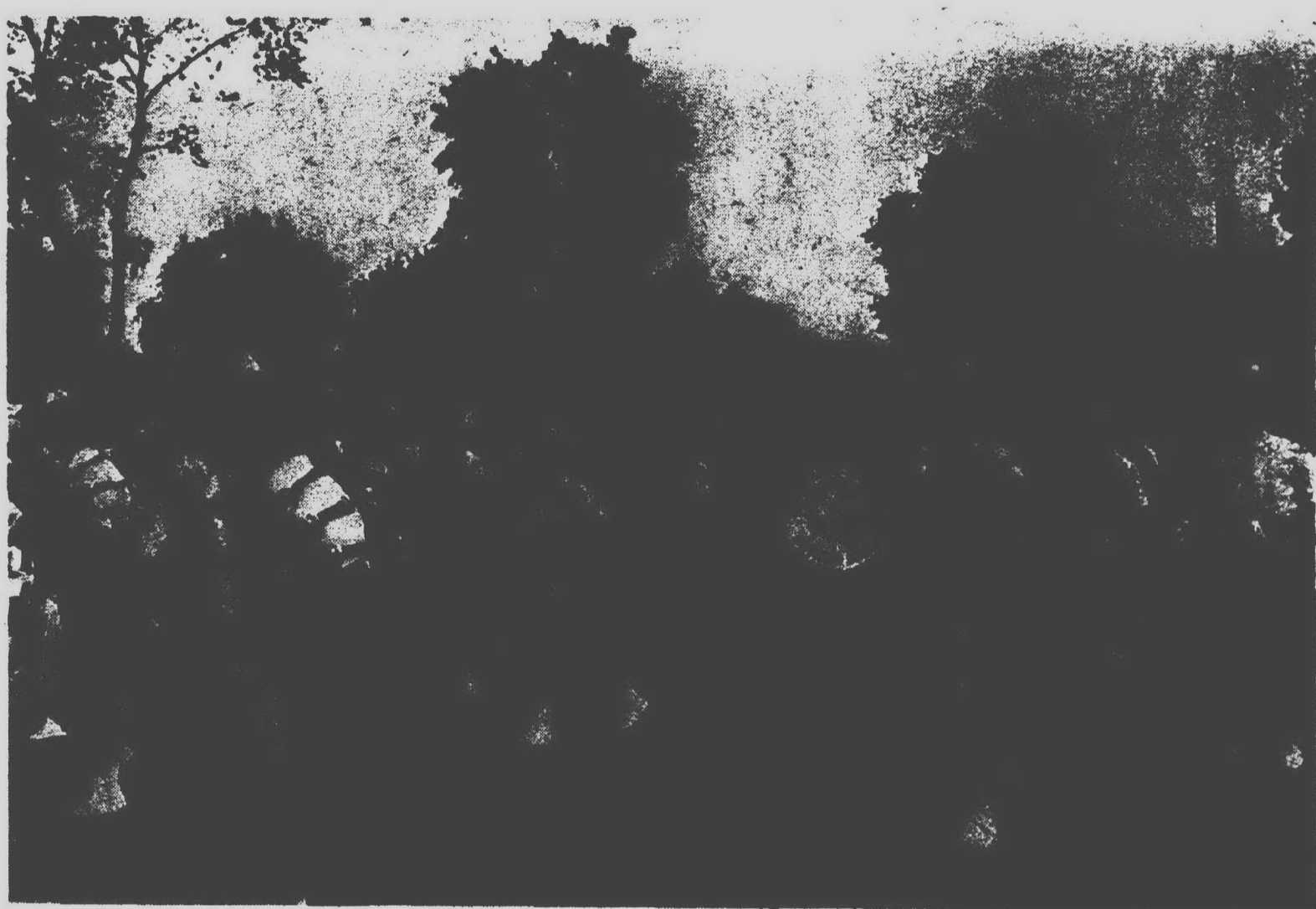

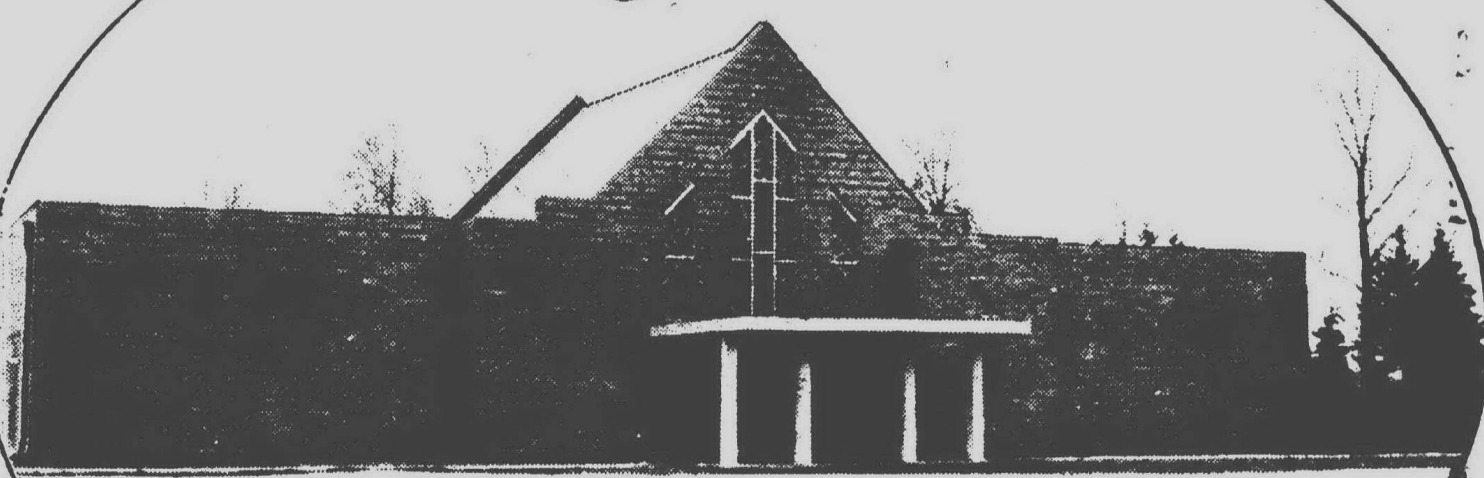

In The Pocket

While almost every conceivable type of competition has cropped up on the bowling front in recent years, the two that caught the fancy for years are now missing.

There was a time — and not so long ago — that team match game competition was popular from coast to coast and folks traveled for miles to see such teams as Strohs, E&B, and Pfeiffer, along with others in the all-star classic in action.

Other cities had their favorites and when these inter-city matches were arranged, the various establishments that housed them bulged with spectators.

While the team match games flourished marathon bowling also was in vogue and many a courageous battle was fought to the finish at the old recreation building in downtown Detroit. Even the building is now just a memory.

Several decades ago a chunky chap named Jake Bomze held the spotlight

and many are the strange tales told about him.

A short, chunky fellow who was a window cleaner by profession, Jake used to claim that he might not be able to bowl better than most of the men — but he could bowl longer.

For a long time his claims went unheeded and he was the champion by word of mouth. Then one day came a fellow to challenge him.

The challenger was Pete Carter, one time member of the Strohs team, and a better than middlin' bowler.

Jake accepted the challenge for a Saturday duel at the old Recreation and there was quite a delegation on hand when the match started. But few paid any attention to Carter's warm-up.

When Bomze stepped on the approaches he had only one bowling ball with him, Carter had two- and this bit of strategy paid off.

Carter had studied the effects of marathon bowling and learned that success depended on the ability of your thumb to withstand the punishment. So, Pete decided on using two balls — one for straightaway bowling and the second — with a large thumb hole for spares. He knew, too, that during the day his right thumb would swell and the ball with the larger thumb hole would do the trick.

This strategy paid off, too, but only after one of the most courageous stands a bowler could make.

As was expected as game after game was bowled, Bomze's thumb began to swell. And when it did Jake did the unexpected! He ordered the drilling of a new ball — with the same old thumb hole.

Finally, after 84 games, and with blood streaming from his thumb Bomze admitted defeat.

It was a defeat that not only dampened his ego, but left him with a sore thumb for two months — to say nothing of the half dozen new bowling balls he had drilled during the day.

That was one of Detroit's famous matches which is now almost lost in history. At the time, it was the talk of the town.

Since then, several attempts have been made to revive marathon bowling. They failed for the simple reason there is not another Jake Bomze around.

Likewise there no longer are such things as the national match games championships for teams. Teams like the Hell's of Milwaukee; Budweiser, of St. Louis; the Cone Herman's of St. Louis and the Falstaffs, of St. Louis.

They reigned in the days before big money was available. Their only cash reward came from their own side bets.

Bowling would be well served if such events could be revived.

The area Adray club that came up

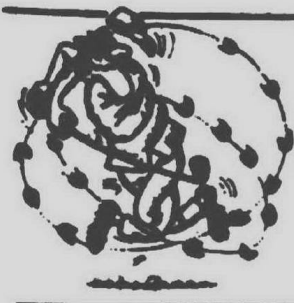
with three runs in the top of the ninth inning to humble ITM, 6-4.

Campers protected

With the 1974 camping season in full swing, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources issues a reminder that visitor restrictions are in effect in many lower peninsula campgrounds.

In previous years, students from area schools often disturbed early season campers by "joyriding" through camping area roads.

"It should be noted, however, this ban applies only to campgrounds in the parks," O.J. Scherschligt, parks division chief, said. "Other areas such as beaches, picnic sites and other state park facilities remain open to general use."

Camping area restrictions will last until Labor Day in Lakeport State Park, Sleeper State Park, Metamore-Hadley Recreation Area, Hayes State Park, and Proud Lake Recreation Area.

Others having the visiting restriction are Silver Lake State Park, Lake Macatawa Campground, Holland State Park, Ludington State Park and South Higgins Lake State Park.

"It is important to understand," Scherschligt said, "we are not prohibiting visitors from using other facilities in these state parks, only from camping areas."

Image of the wolf gets a revision

In the civil rights movement of the 1960s, a lot of our history books were rewritten because of how they treated blacks and other minority groups.

In the '70s there's a new civil rights movement on behalf of the predator animals — the wolf, the coyote, the fox.

Consider the "bad image," to use the public relations man's jargon, given to these predators in "Little Red Riding Hood," the Bre'r Rabbit tales, Pinocchio, "Peter and the Wolf," the Grimm fairy tales and a dozen hundred others. Saliva drips from his jaws: the younger and tenderer his contemplated victim, the better he liked it; to do good was to kill the scoundrel.

A NUMBER OF films, most recently "Brother of the Wind," are telling the wolf's side of the story. Among the myths getting knocked in the head:

- That the wolf (coyote, fox) has a bloodthirsty nature. Actually, he's no nastier than the domestic dog, who's in the same biological genus and family. Watch a modern wolf movie and you'll learn a lot about your own pup.
- That the wolf attacks humans. It has happened, but it's extremely rare. Indeed, a few years ago, Detroit and some suburbs had a serious problem with loose packs of neglected dogs running loose and attacking children.
- That the wolf kills for the pure pleasure of it. This tale seems to stem from stories of partially-eaten carcasses of other animals — carcasses that froze before the solves could finish them.

- That predator animals are a major threat to wildlife. If they were a threat, then wolves would be wiping out their own food supplies. Only man is dumb enough to do that. A wolf fills an important role in nature, keeping under control animals that would otherwise overbreed. Moreover, wolves tend to prey on weaker and older animals, thus improving the hunted species by allowing the fittest to survive. In contrast, human hunters go for the big buck.

Island Lake resource meeting set July 24

A public meeting to discuss preliminary plans for the Island Lake Recreation Area will be held in Brighton July 24, according to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Hawkins Elementary School, located at the intersection of Lee and Rickett Roads in the southeast portion of the city.

Copies of the proposed plan will be distributed at the meeting and representatives of DNR's Parks Division will be on hand to hear recommendations from area citizens and answer possible questions.

Island Lake Recreation Area contains more than 3,400 acres of scenic rolling land in southeast Livingston County. Main feature is the Huron River which flows through the area for more than six miles.

Also featured are two large swimming beaches, numerous campsites and picnic areas. There are ample opportunities for hikers, hunters and fishermen to enjoy the out of doors.

The DNR's proposed plan would retain the present character of the Huron River. "In fact," says O.J. Scherschligt, Parks Division Chief, "much of the proposed development and management provisions would reinforce the wild and free-flowing river theme."

Also proposed, and subject to public input, is a general "face lifting" of existing park facilities such as the beach

house on Lower Kent Lake and the outdoor center.

A single entrance for traffic control is envisioned on Kensington Road just south of the Huron River with several abandoned county roads within the area utilized for interior traffic.

Construction of a nature center building is provided in the proposal. Indoor and outdoor displays and exhibits could interpret the natural environment of the Huron River.
