State nixes Hillside annexation; sets hearing on 2nd petition

The State Boundary Commission Wednesday rejected as legally insufficient a petition by the City of Plymouth to annex the Hillside Inn, now in Plymouth Township, into the city.

On a separate petition the commission set Oct. 22 as the date for a public hearing to be held at Middle School East on the annexation of the Burroughs parking lot across from the Hillside at Haggerty and Plymouth roads.

In the Wednesday proceeding the commission considered two of three annexation petitions which were filed last May in the day voters defeated the proposed consolidation of the city and the township.

A third petition, which will likely come before the boundary commission late this year after the public hearing, is for annexation of the Hillside Inn by the township.

Yesterday's boundary commission

meeting was nearly called off last week when attorneys for the Michigan Township Association requested an injunction to stop the boundary commission from deciding annexation matters.

The township association charged that according to the laws by which the commission was established it lacked the legal authority and jurisdiction to make an annexation.

The signing of a temporary injunction last week to stay with an annexation petition in Chio Township but association attorneys asked that it be extended to cover pending annexation rulings.

Judge Donald L. Reising of the Ingham County Circuit Court on Friday denied the injunction and placed limitations on the boundary commission's decisions in the Chio Township case only.

The Hillside Inn annexation request was rejected after members of the boundary commission, with the advice

of a representative of the Department of State Highways, determined the resolution for annexation approved by the city commission failed to provide an accurate legal description of the parcel to be annexed.

Although the document included a complete map of the Hillside Inn property, its exact location was not adequately described in the body of the resolution, the commission ruled.

"We have never approved an annexation petition without a full legal description," said David R. Calhoun, chairman of the boundary commission.

In the second decision, which ended in the call for a public hearing on annexation of the Burroughs parking lot parcel, the commission overruled objections by the township and found the city's description to be legal and sufficient.

Township Attorney Don Morgan argued the boundary commission may not be empowered to rule on the question.

Elementary school being readied at East

PLYMOUTH—One wing of East Middle School will be converted from the middle grade levels to elementary use in the fall.

According to the Plymouth School board, this change is due to increasing enrollments in kindergarten through third grades and the decreasing number of students in the middle school grades throughout the Plymouth School District.

The board decided after the recent death of the year-round school program to convert six classrooms of the middle school building for use by elementary children for a period of at least two years. Hopefully, after this two year period, the school district will have three new elementary school buildings constructed in the Plymouth area to meet its growing population and expanding educational needs.

"We will start off with a small enrollment of about 85 students at first," says Supt. John M. Hoben. "Later, we anticipate a saturation of 170 students and expect to reach that point by the second semester if we reach it at all."

Students in kindergarten through the fifth grades from primarily the Pickwick subdivision, the major area affected by the conversion, will be bused to East Middle School. In the past, students from this area attended Miller Elementary School.

There are about 85 families in this area affected by the change. They live in the area bounded by Liley Road on the west, Joy Road on the north, Ford Road to the south and the expressway under construction to the east.

"We hope to keep the kids at East for just two years because we plan to have the new elementary schools completed in a year and a half," explains Hoben. "Then we can get the students back into their own elementary school environment."

The wing to be used by the elementary children has six classrooms and is approximately 130 feet long. Each room has an outside entrance that is not connected to the rest of the building.

"It is a completely self-contained and controlled area," continues Hoben. "There will be no need for the students to go through the main parts of the building to get to their classrooms. All the rooms have doors leading right outside."

According to Hoben, there won't be much mingling of elementary and East Middle School students. The elementary classes will start a half hour after East classes and finish a half hour later than the middle school classes.

"Buses will let the elementary children off right at an entrance to the wing so that the students can get right into their environment," says Carl Taylor, principal of East Middle School. "This way, they will not mingle with any of the East students."

"Students at East are very integrated," he continues. "To get from one end of the building to the other students must mingle very much. But, we will educate them to stay out of the elementary wing. There will be no reason for sixth, seventh or eighth graders to be in that wing at all."

The lunch period seems to pose the only real mingling problem between the elementary and East students. But Taylor hopes to work out a solution to that problem.

"We now have an intramural program after lunch for the East kids. This takes most of them out of the picture during the elementary lunch period, but not all of the students," says Taylor. Most local candidates have good voting records

Whether or not their names have appeared on past ballots, Canton and Plymouth township candidates have generally shown their interest in local elections by going to the polls.

Feeling that candidates' records of voting in the elections for posts they are seeking is a measure of their interest, the Plymouth Observer & Eccentric checks voting records before each election. When voters go to the polls is a matter of public record.

Canton Township voter registration records indicate that:

Republican candidate for supervisor Ralph Foote has voted 32 times out of a possible 43 since he registered in the township in 1949. His opponent, James Poole, registered in spring of 1972 and has voted in one of three elections since that time.

Democrat Jack Marts registered in 1969 and has voted in four of the five elections held since then, while Robert Greenstein, his opponent for the supervisor's post, registered in 1968 and has voted on four of a possible seven township election occasions.

Among the candidates for the Democratic nomination for treasurer, Thomas Stevens has voted 29 of a possible 38 times since registering in 1951. Grant Campbell has voted in 21 of the 33 elections held since he registered in 1955.

Both Democrat Carl Parsell and the unopposed Republican candidate for treasurer, Richard Wolfe Jr., have registered within the last two years and have not yet had an opportunity to vote.

Township Clerk John Flodin, who is unopposed in his reelection bid, has voted in 39 of the 41 local elections for which he has been eligible.

Of the three Democrats seeking two nominations for four-year terms, as township trustees, E. Brian Schwall has voted in two of the five township elections held since he registered in 1970, while Robert Myers registered in 1971 and has voted on two of three occasions. Joseph DeLauro registered in 1971 and also has voted in two of three elections for which he has been eligible.

Among Republicans seeking the four-year nominations, Warren Atwood has voted on 17 of 25 possible occasions since he registered in 1958. Joseph Kinnick registered in 1971 and has voted in all three elections held since that time, while William Ryan registered in 1972 and voted in one of the three local elections for which he was eligible.

All three candidates for one two-year term on the board of trustees are Democrats. Frank McMurray registered in 1964 and has voted in eight of the 12 elections held since then. Irene Murphy and Gerald Cheske both registered in 1972 and neither have voted in township elections.

Plymouth Township voter registration records indicate that:

Incumbent Republican Supervisor J. D. McLaren has voted in six of eight elections held since he registered in 1969, while his opponent in the Aug. 6 primary, Maurice Breen, has voted in 20 of 27 elections since registering in 1962.

Township Clerk Helen Richardson, who is unopposed for re-election, has voted in 42 of the 49 township elections for which she has been eligible.

Of the four Republican candidates for treasurer, Thomas Notebaert, who registered in 1966, has voted in 15 of the 17 elections for which he was eligible, while Anna Milligan has voted in 27 of the 43 elections held since she registered in 1955.

Weyona Lee Fidge has voted on 10 of 11 occasions since registering in 1968 and Joseph West has voted seven times in 10 chances since he registered that year.

Two Republicans and two Democrats are vying for nominations for one two-year term on the board of trustees. Republican Frank Millington registered to vote in the township in 1951 and has voted in 40 of the 51 elections held since then, while Richard Gornick has voted in nine of the 12 elections held since he registered in 1968.

Of the Democrats, Orville Tungate, who registered in 1954, has voted in 45 of the 49 local elections held since then while Thomas Sullivan has voted in all five elections held since he registered in 1971.

# GM honors 4 area residents

LIVONIA—Angie Corrieri, of Plymouth, a computer programmer at the General Motors Spring and Bumper plant in Livonia, Wednesday received the coveted gold medal award for excellence in community activities.

She was selected from the field of 10 finalists. The top winners were announced in a luncheon meeting in the

Hillside Inn by Richard Dauch, head of the Livonia Plant and City Committee of GM and plant manager of the spring and bumper division.

All finalists received plaques with gold, silver and bronze medals presented to the top three. Four of the finalists were from Livonia, Redford Township and Plymouth.

MISS CORRIERI, who lost the use of her legs in an automobile accident three years ago, has been an employee of the spring and bumper plant for five years. She does all of her work from a wheelchair.

"It was really heartwarming to learn of all the good work being done by our Livonia employees in their various communities and the countless hours they have spent trying to enrich and improve the lives of their fellow citizens," said Dauch before making the presentations.

Miss Corrieri won the gold medal for her dedicated service to mobility-limited persons throughout Michigan and for her efforts to endorse legislation to adopt barrier-free design in the basic building codes of the state.

Jerry Harville of Taylor, an employee of Fisher Body, was awarded the silver medal for his active work with the Veterans of Foreign Wars Hospital in Allen Park. He has nine years service with Fisher Body.

The bronze award went to Geneva Spencer of Detroit, also employed at Fisher Body, for her volunteer work with the Cancer Society, NAACP, various neighborhood youth groups and church work. She has 12 years service at the plant.

TWO LIVONIA residents and one from Redford Township were among the finalists.

They are: Walter Shellhorn, of Livonia, with five years at Fisher Body who was honored for his achievements in the field of police training and his work as a volunteer officer of the Livonia Civil Defense-Auxiliary Police.

The other is Albert Uren, of Cadillac Motors, who has devoted hours and hours of his time to volunteer work as a probation officer for the 16th District Court in Livonia.

Stewart Warren of Redford Township, a worker at the GM Parts plant, was recognized for his work with the Little League, forming bowling leagues for GM workers, and efforts to get the ice arena in the township.

The other finalists were: William O'Malley of Detroit, Fred Davis of Ypsilanti, Mary Lou Carey of New Boston, and George Coy of Howell.

Miss Corrieri will be one of the honored guests at a Sept. 19 banquet in the St. Regis Hotel in Detroit when gold medal winners from across the country will be recognized by General Motors.







# Canton Township to get 1st husband, wife constables

CANTON—Since Mr. and Mrs. Jack Blevins have been sharing the load for a long time, it seems only fair to both to take one more step.

The Blevins are both running unopposed for Canton Township constables.

There are four constable candidates on the Aug. 6 ballot and four to be elected. This will be a first for Mrs. Blevins and a first for the township—the township has never had a woman constable before.

Blevins is seeking election for the third time. He ran and was elected constable in 1970 and 1972. This is the first time he is unopposed.

Mrs. Blevins, who says she is "getting a thrill out of it", put her name and petition in as a candidate as a "sort of a joke" at the beginning. Now she is now very serious.

When she tried to withdraw, John Flodin, township clerk said, "No way, we really need a woman."

Mrs. Blevins who has watched her husband in his constable work from the beginning, is also convinced there's a place for a woman in the job which is part-time.

The constable receives no salary, he is paid per subpoena, summons or other notice successfully delivered. "I think there are many times," says

Mrs. Blevins, "when a woman can make the approach to deliver a summons or a subpoena easier than a man—for one thing, they don't suspect what you're there for."

She continues, "It's not always a pleasant job—the people you serve have usually been served before—but I think it could be made more pleasant in the future."

Township constables serve all the Canton legal papers for the 35th District Court. Since the township has no police department of its own, it depends on the Wayne County Sheriff Dept. and the State Police for protection.

The couple are hopeful that someday the community which has been their home for eight years will have a department of its own someday. And they wouldn't mind being part of it.

Blevins says, "I have always wanted to be a policeman," and the prospect of being a policewoman is also tempting to his wife.

She likes the people of the Canton-Plymouth area and knows many of them well. She worked at Krogers in Plymouth for many years and was recently transferred to Livonia.

"I like people," she says, "I get along well with them I'm a talker, he's not."

Saying that she believes togetherness is a good thing, Mrs. Blevins says she and her constable-husband have long shared the work both inside and outside their home. She has been doing the paper work and billing for the constable job ever since he was elected, and her election will give her the chance to be officially recognized for her work.

The couple have a nine-year-old son

and a 15 year-old-daughter.

Blevins is a full time employee at Ford Parts Depot of Livonia.

Also running unopposed for the con-

stable posts are Gene W. Reaves of Lot 424, 39500 W. Warren Rd., and Timothy W. Murphy, of Lot 296, 39500 W. Warren Rd.



ment patios will be constructed outside each classroom door, new shades will be installed and tree branches in

some courtyards will be cut. Sand boxes and play areas will be built in these courtyards for the younger students.

Part of one classroom will be used for an office so all elementary school activities can be directed from inside the building.

Hoben says the district "considered borrowing furniture from the other school buildings but decided to purchase all new furniture and any needed equipment for the elementary wing.

The teaching staff at the East Middle School elementary wing will consist of two experienced teachers from Miller Elementary School and two new teachers the district will hire.

Most of the students attending the new elementary school will be in kindergarten, first and second grades. According to Mrs. Otto, who will take over the administrative duties for the

elementary wing, there will be two sessions of kindergarten.

"There are about 30 students on the kindergarten level and we plan to divide them into two different sessions," she says. "All the other classes are smaller, but they will grow as the Plymouth area grows."

Taylor says the middle school "will make good use of these new students." Already he has received requests from teachers at East to use the younger pupils in home economic classes and to have them tutored by special eighth graders.

"We are making all kinds of plans for the new students," he says. "Since they will be here for at least two years, we might as well take advantage of the opportunity."

Hoben plans to have all the parents and students affected by the con-

version at East Middle School contacted soon for an orientation to the new facilities and explain what the district plans to do there.

"Everyone affected by this change has been very cooperative and interested in what we plan to do. So we should orientate them and answer all their questions as soon as possible."

tion. The title of the act which created the commission, he said, "reflects noting to do with providing for annexation."

He also said that because documents have already been filed calling for incorporation of Plymouth Township as the city of Plymouth Heights, the township is technically incorporated and "the petition is invalid because it seeks to annex part of another city."

Boundary Commissioner Irving W.

Rozian, a Plymouth Township resident, abstained from the proceedings.

Because the Burroughs parking lot property has fewer than 100 inhabitants, a vote can not be taken before it is annexed. The commission will make its final determination on the matter following the Oct. 22 public hearing.

A spokesman for Hillside Realty of Detroit, owners of the parcel, said that the firm received no notification of the hearing and had no opinion on the annexation question.



## Weeds choke baseball's past

PLYMOUTH — The roar of the crowd has faded into a mere echo, the screaming of the proud parents urging their sons on sparkling deeds in the Little League is only a memory and the monument erected to one of the men who made it all possible stands forlorn in a bed of weeds on the side of Plymouth Road at the entrance to Riverside Cemetery.

Only six short years ago, on this same spot, the Little League was a living thing and its members were joined by the townspeople in paying tribute to the memory of the late Charlie Dudley, who had helped organize the league only a few seasons before.

monument—made possible by the gifts of the townsfolk—was dedicated to his honor. The dedication went far beyond the unveiling of a mere stone. It carried a plea that the spirit engendered on the playing field would help guide the youth toward manhood.

It was a great day. Now, six years later, the Little League has been forced to move to make room for more space in the cemetery. The base paths are covered with weeds and giant earth movers are cutting new roads through the outfield.

And the monument that was the center of attraction on that bright sunny afternoon, now stands there in the summer sun, a drug on the community.

No one knows what to do with it.

The city has no use for it. Ken Vogras, city superintendent of Public Works, says he has offered it to Mrs. Dudley to do with it what she wants. And she is at a loss, too.

"I really don't know what to do," she said, "but I'd hate to see it destroyed. Before that would happen I'd have it moved into our backyard. It meant so much to so many people."

The chief concern in the future site of the stone is that the Little League hasn't now—and may never have—a permanent home. At the moment the players are using the high school area until the Plymouth Township Recreation site is completed. Even then, it is

said, that site may not be permanent and that there can be no continual moving of the stone.


And there it stands in the weeds— forlorn and just about forgotten.

There was a time when the ideals and dreams of fellows like Joe Bida, John Duke and Charles Beagle helped Dudley organize the league as a means of providing activity for the youth of the city.

But in the six short years since that afternoon when Charlie Dudley was honored great changes have taken place.

The need for additional grave sites in the cemetery forced the league to move and, according to Vogras, the baseball diamonds have provided 2,500 additional graves that should meet the needs of the community for 20 years and that the entire area will be plotted by the year 2000.

In the mean time the spirit of Charlie Dudley lives on, but the monument is a forlorn looking thing chained in the weeds.





When Lincoln pronounced the couple man and wife, Wilmot kissed his bride twice.


In the reception line, he also got to buss the girls' softball team while the bride, 21, complained that she could only shake hands with them.

# Dumas blasts commissioners on executive vote action

Commissioner Mary E. Dumas (R-Livonia) says the Wayne County Board of Commissioners has "failed its commitment to the citizenry" in failing to place a county executive proposal on the November ballot.

But the chairman of the board meeting at which she made her bid responded by saying the amendments on which the commitment was based haven't been adopted by the State Legislature.

He added it would cost taxpayers \$500,000 for a special election if the proposal went on the ballot without amendment.

MRS. DUMAS introduced a resolution at the July 25 meeting proposing to place on the Nov. 5 ballot this question: "Shall the people of Wayne County elect a chief executive?"

But she failed twice to get the two-thirds majority vote necessary to give immediate consideration to a new item of business. She needed the votes of 18 of the 27 commissioners.

Mrs. Dumas expresses extreme dismay, saying the executive statute requires the board to act at least 90 days prior to the election.

"Considering that on May 2 the commissioners could have elected to place the question on the Aug. 6 primary ballot, I have believed since then that their November preference was a stalling technique, and today's action bears that out."

"The board has failed its commitment and has failed again to allow the voters of Wayne County to decide

for themselves if they want a chief executive."

ROSCOE BOBO (D-Ecorse), board vice-chairman who chaired the meeting, took strong exception to her remarks.

"Assuming she has no political motive, Mrs. Dumas apparently doesn't understand the nature of our May 2 action. It was clear to everybody else. We adopted the recommendation of our general government committee that, because of the strong opposition expressed at a public hearing, we not place the question on the primary election ballot."

"The committee recommended instead that we plan on placing the proposal on the Nov. 5 ballot, providing amendments passed the legislature to eliminate some of the weaknesses that generated opposition." Amendments to accomplish that were introduced by Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) but are still in the House.

"One of these amendments would allow us to place the question on the ballot without a concurrent primary election," Bobo continued. "As the law now stands, primary candidates would run in November. Then if the proposal passed, half a million dollars would have to be spent for a special countywide run-off election. That fact alone is enough to ensure its defeat."

"Given all the circumstances, it would be political hypocrisy to put the present plan on the ballot. It would surely be defeated and split the community in the process."

Opposition was expressed last April by representatives of the UAW, AFL-CIO, Wayne County Democratic Committee, Detroit Mayor Coleman Young, elected county officials other than commissioners, and Black political and community leaders.

Critics charged that the legislation as it now stands is vague and contains inconsistencies and contradictions.

Mrs. Dumas says: "It appears that Wayne County's efforts to reach the 20th Century by having a full time executive to administer day-to-day affairs has been delayed for at least another two years."

She described the present county structure as "unwieldy and often ineffective due to the dual necessity of the commissioners to serve both as a legislative and administrative body."

## Rouge clean up gets green light

County Commissioner Richard E. Manning (D-Redford), whose Clean Up the Rouge Youth Employment Program appeared in doubt recently because of a question raised on the possibility of water-borne infections, released a report from the health department giving the green light to continue the project.

"John Stock, acting director of the health department, conferred at my request with the leading medical and public health specialists and announced that in using ordinary sanitary precautions there is no danger of infection," Manning said.

The program, now in its second year, is the initial step in what Manning hopes to develop into a comprehensive summer work program for all in the county between ages 14 and 20.

Presently, only children from low-income families are eligible for the program.

Manning said he hopes, in the next session of Congress, this restriction will be lifted so any young person can enroll regardless of family income.

"Lack of jobs for youngsters from the middle-income family is having a serious effect on those who want to continue their education."

"This program would be a valuable work experience even for those who do not plan on attending college, as it would help reduce the pressures of inflation on the part of the parents income."



## Polish Council lists endorsements

The Central Citizens Committee (Polish Coordinating Council of Greater Detroit) has released its lists of endorsements for the Aug. 6 primary, including support for candidates running in Livonia, Plymouth, Garden City, Westland, Redford and Canton townships.

The council consists of delegates of about 200 fraternal, civic, veterans, labor and community organizations. Its political action committee interviewed some 70 candidates in person and received completed questionnaires from others.

For Congress, the council endorsed Democrat John S. Reuther in the 2nd District which includes Livonia and Plymouth and backed Democrat William D. Ford in the 15th which includes Westland, Garden City and Canton Township. In the 17th, Democrat Patrick A. McDonald received the endorsement.

In the 13th State Senate District, which includes Westland, Garden City and Canton, the council endorsed incumbent Sen. William Faust (D-Westland). It didn't endorse in the 14th Senate District now represented by Sen.

Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth).

In the Michigan House districts, endorsements were given to Democrats Arnold Lutz in the 33rd, Ernest Grant in the 35th, Robert Erwin in the 37th, and David Malhalab in the 34th.

The 33rd District includes Garden City, the 34th includes Redford Township, the 35th comprises part of Livonia and Northville and the 37th includes Canton and parts of Westland and Plymouth Township. In all four House seats the council failed to endorse incumbents — William Keith in the 33rd, John Bennett in the 34th, Robert Geake in the 35th and Thomas Brown in the 37th. Of the incumbents, only Geake is a Republican.

The council didn't make recommendations in the 36th or 52nd House districts. John Markes (D-Westland) is the incumbent in the 36th. Republican Ray Smit of Ann Arbor isn't seeking re-election in the 52nd. There are no primary contests in either of these House districts.

The council also endorsed Sander Levin for governor, Richard T. Kelly for county auditor, Democratic Richard Manning for Wayne County Commissioner in the 18th, and Mary Dumas who is a Republican Wayne County Commissioner in the 19th. The 18th includes Redford and Livonia, and the 19th is Livonia only.

## House approves juveniles bill backed by Ford

A runaway youth bill, introduced two years ago by U.S. Rep. William D. Ford, (D-Taylor) was incorporated into juvenile delinquency legislation recently approved by the House of Representatives by a vote of 329-20.

Ford, whose 15th district includes Westland, Garden City and Canton Township, was one of the leaders in the floor debate and argued strongly for passage of the bill, the Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974.

"This bill would provide structure to our current patchwork system of juvenile justice and develop a system responsive to the needs of juveniles."

"The problem of juvenile delinquency is becoming ever more serious and how to prevent it has never before been addressed in a serious and productive manner."

THE BILL would establish a juvenile delinquency administration, allocate funds to all states based on the number of persons under the age of 18 and require the states to draft their own plans for preventing and treating juvenile delinquency.

One section of the bill incorporates Ford's runaway youth proposal which establishes a federal assistance program for the runaway youths and their families.

It authorizes grants to local communities and non-profit agencies to develop facilities to serve runaway youths without resorting to police or juvenile courts.

According to Ford, research and study are particularly needed to determine the dimension of the delinquency problem. "It is estimated that more than a million youngsters run away each year. Simply returning them to their homes is often not the proper answer."

"THESE RUNAWAY children, contrary to general belief, do not usually commit crimes. They are more often the victims of crimes."

"Under our present system, these young people are detained in jails or detention homes where they are exposed to older, more experienced lawbreakers. As a result, many are literally encouraged into a life of crime."

"I think this legislation is absolutely vital if we are to find the answers now and take action before the situation reaches a crisis point."

## Nearly 100 attend information night

Schoolcraft College's second annual information night held recently attracted about 100 people to the campus.

The response has prompted Vice President Ed McNally to announce tentative plans for an information night during November.

"Those attending indicated favorable reaction to our program," he said, "and they especially liked the individual and small group attention our staff gave them."

Information night is for anyone in the community who wants to learn more about Schoolcraft College and what it has to offer. It is a presentation of the Student Affairs Division which McNally heads.


McNally said that a further indicator of the program's acceptance is reflected in the number of admissions and counseling appointments requested by those who attended.

## Views on campaign reform

# 2nd District candidates polled by Common Cause

Most of the candidates for Congress in the 2nd District, which includes Livonia and Plymouth, have been polled on campaign reform issues by Common Cause.

The citizens' lobby led by John Gardner nationally reported that most of the candidates support public financing for presidential and congressional elections. Most would also vote to establish an independent agency to monitor campaign spending.

These are among the results of a survey of the candidates during July taken by the local unit of Common Cause, 310 S. Ashley, Ann Arbor.

THE FOLLOWING questions were put to each candidate:

The law already provides for public financing of presidential general elections. Will you vote this year for public financing of congressional general elections? Congressional primary elections? Presidential primaries?

Will you vote to grant an independent agency on campaign spending laws the authority to prosecute violators, without referral to the Justice Department?

Will you vote in favor of limiting political contributions by individuals and special interest groups or committees to no more than \$1,000 a year for House and Senate candidates and \$2,500 for presidential candidates; and

In the interests of real competition for House seats, will you vote for expenditure ceilings of at least \$90,000 for primaries and \$90,000 for general elections to the House?

RESPONSES TO the questionnaire were received from:

Incumbent Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor); Democratic candidates Ronald Egnor, Marjorie Lansing, Edward Pierce and John Reuther; Human Rights Party candidate Phil Carroll; and from Martha Pettit, candidate of the Socialist Worker Party.

Ms. Pettit was the only respondent to the questionnaire who declined to answer the questions in the form presented.

The only candidate not responding was Roy Jones, American Independent Party candidate. Difficulties in contacting Theo Williams, another Democratic candidate, prevented Common Cause from obtaining his response to the questionnaire.

ESCH STRONGLY supports public financing for presidential elections and says he is working with two congressmen now to provide an amendment that will provide a matching basis for support in congressional elections.

"I believe it is unwise for us to support presidential primary elections because it would bring about a proliferation of candidates."

On the second question, Esch said: "A bill which I introduced on Nov. 1, 1973, contained a proposal to develop an independent agency, and to prosecute violators without referral to the Justice Department. I continue to hold that view."

Esch supports limiting political contributions to \$1,000 a year for House and Senate candidates and \$2,500 for presidential candidates. "I support the elimination of all special interest group giving, and will support a limitation of individual giving at lower levels."

Esch also supports expenditure ceilings as contained in the original Anderson-Udall bill of \$90,000 for House seats. "I do believe this could be further limited and will support amendments to limit this total amount even further."

EGNOR ANSWERED yes to all three points of the first question.

"I do believe, however, some mechanism should be provided to insure candidates actually have substantial community support and aren't just one-issue or splinter candidates."

He supports the independent agency providing it can be made truly non-partisan. He adds that "Congress should have some watchdog powers over it so it cannot become an independent 'blackmail agency' in the wrong hands."

Egnor answers yes to the third question, provided the reforms listed are implemented so candidates can, in fact, wage effective campaigns.

Egnor also agrees with the fourth question. "I believe it is important, when addressing the concerns of questions one and four, that some provision be made for countering the obvious advantage an incumbent has."

"Making franking privileges (free mailing, now available to incumbent congressmen and senators) available to all legitimate candidates would be one way."

LANSING FAVORS "the toughest campaign financing laws that the congress and-or state legislature can devise."

"As a political scientist with a spe-

cialization in the legislative process I am familiar with the various reform proposals, and also comparative financing systems in other democratic societies.

"Specifically, I would vote for public financing of congressional general and primary elections, and presidential primaries."

Mrs. Lansing would vote for an independent agency without referral to the Justice Department. "The weak measures we have had prior to the 1971 legislation never had any enforcing machinery, thus were not enforced."

She strongly favors the contribution limits of \$1,000 and \$2,500. "This would help to reduce the politics of influence."

Mrs. Lansing would prefer to see the ceilings for expenditures for House seats placed at a very much lower level. "How can a candidate raise \$90,000? If question three is implemented, the candidate will spend all her time raising funds to meet that high ceiling. Why not cut it back?"

PIERCE SAYS he will definitely vote for public financing of both congressional general and primary elections, and for presidential primaries. "In the primaries, however, public funding should only go to such candidates who in some fashion demonstrate a large public following."

Pierce strongly supports the inde-

pendent agency idea. The agency, he says, should "have not only the authority to independently prosecute violators, but also have more than ample funding and investigatory staff so it can be a real watchdog rather than a rubber-stamp certifier of political campaigns."

Pierce also supports the \$1,000 and \$2,500 contribution limits. "In fact, my own primary campaign has limited itself to accepting no more than \$200 from any individual and \$500 from any group, making me the only candidate in the Democratic primary announcing any limitations at all."

He strongly supports expenditure ceilings for House seats. "I think the \$90,000 figure is fine for the general election. However, I would rather go even further as far as the primary is concerned, and have a much lower ceiling. I have unilaterally limited my own campaign to \$15,000."

REUTHER COMPLETELY supports the concept of public financing of elections.

"I will vote for public financing of congressional primary and general elections, as well as presidential primaries. We will never improve the character of those we elect until we change the present method of financing campaigns."

He also supports the independent agency on campaign spending laws

without referral to the Justice Department. "Recent events connected with the Watergate scandal have clearly indicated the necessity of an independent campaign practices agency."

Reuther also supports the \$1,000 and \$2,500 contribution limits.

On expenditures, he says: "I favor an expenditure ceiling of no less than \$90,000 for House primaries and no less than \$90,000 for House general elections."

CARROLL WOULD vote for public financing of congressional general elections and primaries, and presidential primaries.

"I would vote to grant prosecution authority to a campaign spending agency, provided it was decentralized and elected by the people in each area."

"I would vote to limit contributions, and would favor limits even lower than Common Cause proposals."

Carroll would also vote to limit total expenditures for House seats and would favor limits even lower than \$90,000.

ACCORDING TO Ms. Pettit, campaign financing laws "discriminate against small parties such as the Socialist Workers Party."

"To receive public financing, for example, a party must have received five per cent of the vote the previous

year — which no party except the Democrats and Republicans have done."

Noting the ways in which regulatory laws discriminate against her party in

her belief, Ms. Pettit explained that the American Civil Liberties Union is filing a suit on behalf of the Socialist Workers Party to challenge the constitutionality of the reform laws.





# 2 veteran officials, newcomer vie for Senate

Two veteran public officials are among three candidates in the Aug. 6 primaries for their party's nomination for state senate from the 14th District. The district includes Plymouth, Livonia, Redford Township, and part of Westland.

Incumbent Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) is unopposed in the primary. Democrat Don Christie, a Redford Township trustee, will be running against Michael O'Shea of Redford Township.

Christie is a metal model engineer for Chrysler. He is also legislative chairman of the Southeast Michigan Beautification Association.

Pursell is running for his second four-year term in the senate. He is a member of the senate appropriations committee and the governmental efficiency committee.

IN ANSWER to questions submitted to candidates by the Observer & Eccentric the two men split on support for a proposed \$100 million transportation bond issue.

Pursell replied: "I will support the transportation bond issue when I am convinced the communities I represent are treated equitably in the distribution of services. This must be a coordinated effort to assure fairness to all suburban areas as well as large cities."

Christie supports the bond issue but says the best personnel available are needed to administer the program.

"I support the proposed \$100 million bond issue because if approved it would help obtain \$1.1 billion to develop public transportation in Michigan over the next 25 years. However, getting the right personnel in the administration of these funds is imperative."

"We need the best qualified people in the mass transportation field that are available. With federal funds totaling 80 per cent, added to state monies comprising 20 per cent, Michigan could realize up to \$6.1 billion for future state programs."

Both candidates support open meetings. Christie says he is encouraging open meetings in all governmental bodies and Pursell replied he supports an open meeting bill.

Christie commented: "The 'closed door' policy has been used and abused so much lately it has created widespread resentment and mistrust of all governing bodies. To regain respect for government, I am now encouraging many more people to become involved in governmental activities."

"I encourage the civic associations, the chamber of commerce and all other organizations to take part in attending governmental meetings because I believe all meetings should be open to all the people."

Pursell replied: "I am supporting an 'open meeting' bill. I believe all

sessions should be open except when discussing personnel problems of a private nature and setting prices for the acquisition of property."

IN ANSWER to the question "What is your attitude toward state land use legislation?" Pursell replied: "The primary purpose of considering land use legislation is to preserve and properly utilize our natural acreage before it is totally placed in jeopardy by commercial, industrial and residential development."

"We must encourage local leadership to work in cooperation with state leaders to develop a rational plan. The legislature, representing the

people, should act as a 'catalyst' to ensure responsible use of our land, not only for this generation but for generations to come."

Christie replied to the same question: "The big problem is that large exploiters of state lands have the money to hire the best legal aides. When a small local government puts up a legal battle, they are usually in over their heads. It is like a high school football team playing against the pros."

"We definitely need legislation that has teeth in it. The present proposed state legislation has been rendered in-

effective over the past year by countless deletions."

WHEN ASKED "Who are your personal political heroes," both candidates named U.S. senators.

Christie said: "I hold a great deal of respect for the late Estes Kefauver, former senator from Tennessee. Kefauver commands my respect because he was an independent who fought for the people against organized crime in the 1950s."

Pursell named two men as his political heroes.

"At the age of 10, I had the opportunity of visiting the U.S. House of Representatives and having breakfast

with Congressman George Dondero. He placed me on the mailing list for the Congressional Record and I have followed the accomplishments of our leaders since that time in the 1940s."

"I would select Sen. Arthur Vandenberg as the most outstanding statesman of our time. President Truman called him a great American. I personally believe that Sen. Vandenberg and Congressman Dondero, who was the 'father of the St. Lawrence Seaway,' exemplified the highest order of statesmanship in American politics."

THE CANDIDATES were asked: "Who is to blame for segregation in

the suburbs and what should the state do about it?"

Pursell replied: "In all situations, I have felt that its better to solve the problem than to fix the blame. Economics is the single greatest factor contributing to so-called 'suburban segregation' and forced governmental action would only tend to further polarize people."

"We should adopt a positive approach and work for a higher standard of living for all our citizens."

To the same question, Christie replied: "Nobody is to blame. The state should do nothing."

# The churches' role in Plymouth history

PLYMOUTH—To what extent, if any, should the church become involved in the temporal side of life?

Like their counterparts in other communities throughout the United States, residents of Plymouth have had to face up to that question several times in the past 149 years. Two instances stand out: the churches' opposition to the sale of liquor, highlighted by Carry Nation's visit to Plymouth in 1906; and the attempt to stop Mrs. Kate Allen from showing Sunday movies in 1922.

Seven religious denominations estab-

lished churches in Plymouth prior to World War I.

IN 1826, barely a year after the homesteaders arrived, Rev. Joseph Hickox of the Methodist Episcopal Church held a meeting at the home of William Tibbitts on Section 28. Two years later, Plymouth became part of the denomination's Huron district. Services were held in school and farm houses. By 1834, the number in the Plymouth congregation had reached 411, more than that of Detroit.

In that same year, Rev. Marcus Swift, who had led the congregation

since 1833, withdrew because of the slavery controversy within the church. By 1835, Methodists were meeting in a frame church building at what was called Cooper's Corners. In 1848, a church building was erected on a lot, bought from E. J. Penniman for

\$75, at the corner of Adams and Church Streets.

The building was remodeled in 1874 and destroyed by the fire of 1916 which also destroyed the adjacent high school. A new church building, built on the site in 1917, served the congregation until the existing church was opened on North Territorial Road, opposite Ridgewood, in 1971.

THE BAPTIST Society was organized in 1830 at the home of Silas Sly. In 1834, Elder Carpenter began preaching in the old cooper shop at Cooper's Corners. A church building was com-

pleted in 1840 at Shutt's Corners on Ann Arbor Road, four miles west of Plymouth.

The Plymouth Village Baptist Society was organized in North Village in 1846. This and the Shutt's Corners Society united under the leadership of William B. Grow in 1848.

The old Presbyterian building was bought for \$110 and moved to a half-acre plot on N. Mill donated by George Starkweather. In 1856, a new church building was erected on the same site, using materials from the Shutt's Corners church which was

razed. The existing church on North Territorial Road between Sheldon and Ridgewood was completed in 1909.

The first meeting of the Presbyterian Society was held in the home of Ira Bronson on the corner of what is now Penniman and Sheldon in 1833. Rev. Eric Prince and Rev. Ira Weid represented the Presbytery. James Purdy and Ira Bronson were named first elders of the church. Rev. Alexander McJunkin became the first minister in 1835.

In that year a new frame building was erected at a cost of \$386. In 1847, a new brick building was put up on the present site of the church. This building, remodelled in 1877, was destroyed by fire in 1936. In 1937, Rev. Walter Nichol dedicated the new church which has since been expanded on the same site at Church Street and Adams.

REV. FRIEDRICH Schmid came from Ann Arbor in 1856 to organize St. Peter Evangelical Lutheran Church, the second oldest Lutheran Church in Wayne County. The meeting was held at Peter Gayde's north side cooper shop.

Meetings were held in houses until the old Baptist Church building was purchased and moved later in the year. That building was sold in 1882 and a new church, which cost \$2,291, was built in 1883. Rev. Schmid was pastor from 1856 to 1861.

In 1942, a portion of Mrs. Allen's subdivision was purchased at Penniman Avenue and Evergreen. The existing church was dedicated there in 1955.

The First Church of Christ, Scientist began in 1898 with meetings at Safford Hall, over the Fralick store facing Kellogg Park. A church building was erected on the corner of Main and Dodge, next to the old City Hall, in 1903. This was the first Christian Science Church in the State of Michigan to be erected expressly for church use.

After being used as a combined church and reading room for 55 years it was sold to the City of Plymouth in 1957 and razed to make room for the present City Hall. First services in the present Christian Science Church were held in 1958 at 1100 W. Ann Arbor Trail on the spot where John Kellogg's home once stood.

THE ORIGIN of St. John Episcopal Church goes back to 1898 when the women's guild of St. John's Mission was organized at the home of Mrs. Warren Mills. In 1900, services were held over Singleton's store near the railroad depot. After 1903, the mission was temporarily closed due to lack of members. In 1912, St. John's Guild was reorganized with Mrs. D. Burrows as president. The first church was built on Union Street in 1920-1. The existing church, located at 574 Sheldon, was dedicated by Bishop Richard S. Emrich in 1960.

Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic parish celebrated its first mass in the Grange Hall in Plymouth on Palm Sunday, 1915. In 1920, Rev. Francis C. Lefevre was appointed resident pastor and a church was purchased. A new church, on Union Street, was destroyed by fire in 1932. Mass was celebrated in a temporary church on the corner of William and Arthur Streets. The present church on the corner of Penniman and Arthur was dedicated by Archbishop (now Cardinal) John F. Dearden in 1966.

THE DEMAND which existed for used church buildings, and the standard of workmanship of 19th century Plymouth carpenters, can be deduced from an account of a frame church building erected by the Presbyterians in 1835.

It was sold in 1849 to Henry B. Holcomb who sold it, a short time later, to the Baptists who moved it. The Baptists sold it to the Lutherans in 1856, who sold it to Henry Fisher in 1882. Fisher used it as a harness shop next to his blacksmith shop on Spring near Starkweather. Eventually a farmer west of town bought it from Fisher and used it for a shed.

# Harness racing will return Friday to Northville Fair

After an absence of 32 years, harness racing will return to the program of the revitalized Northville Community Fair. There won't be any parimutuel betting but Northville Downs Racing Secretary Harry Peterson stayed over to arrange the races for Friday's matinee card at 2 p.m.

The four-day fair opens officially Thursday but the addition of the harness racing is expected to be a big plus, a plus for the admissions since the program will be open to all, children of one to oldtimers of 100. They'll all be able to watch the pacers and trotters perform.

IN ITS FIFTH year the Northville Fair, formerly known as the Wayne County Fair up through 1942, the program has received recognition from the state and thus is able to receive a

share of the racing purses from the Michigan treasury.

The law provides that a recognized fair shall receive three dollars from the state for every dollar the Fair Association puts up for racing purses.

The horses will compete in eight races for individual purses of \$1,200 for a grand total of \$9,600.

## Bill Ford declines to publish primary campaign finances

U.S. Rep. William D. Ford (D-Taylor), whose 15th District includes Westland, Garden City and Canton Township, is the only primary candidate running for his office who has declined to disclose publicly the sources and amounts of his campaign expenses through July 22.

That claim was made recently by Walker J. Morrow of Dearborn Heights, the 15th District volunteer legislative contact for Common Cause in Michigan.

Common Cause, the national citizens' lobby, is requesting all congressional candidates in the nation to disclose publicly their campaign finances as a service to voters.

Morrow cited the latest Harris Survey public opinion poll which indicates 69 per cent of the public now demand full disclosure of all big contributors to political campaigns.

"Common Cause contends that the public has every right to know, before each election, who is spending how much to finance each candidate's race. We urge Rep. Ford's supporters and constituents to persuade him to change his mind regarding these essential matters concerning money and secrecy," says Morrow.

Ford is unopposed on the Democratic slate. His Republican challengers, who both voluntarily disclosed, are Jack A. Underwood of Westland and Edgar R. Nieton of Romulus.

Both reported less than \$100 total contributions and expenses. Only contributors of more than \$100 are required to be identified by name, according to the 1971 Federal Election Campaign Law.

Common Cause will publish Ford's campaign finances as soon as he files that information, as required by law, with the clerk of the House of Representatives, concludes Morrow.



# 'Steamy' chores waste energy

## Home & Garden

Central air conditioning units are being sold in record numbers despite the energy crunch; industry figures say that more than 12 million American homes have central air conditioning.

Part of the increase in sales is for replacement units but many of the installations were new units.

The industry association, the Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Institute, lists several things homeowners can do to make their central air conditioning unit work efficiently.

The most important principle to understand at the beginning is that heat and humidity which enter the house

from the outside or which are produced inside the house, impose a heavy load on the system.

So to save energy, concentrate on ways to prevent heat and humidity coming inside and from being created inside. Here are some ways you can do this.

Household activities such as cooking, bathing, mopping floors and doing laundry - the "steamy" chores

are major producers of indoor humidity.

Indoor heat is also generated by many of these activities, as well as by sun streaming in unshaded windows.

Obviously, you can't give up such activities. But if you can, re-schedule them for the cooler morning or late evening hours; you will be taking a load off your air conditioner during the mid-day and afternoon, when outside temperatures are the highest.

In addition, use your stove fan to ventilate steam created by cooking, or consider closing off your kitchen if you are taking on an all-day cooking project such as canning. Close air conditioning vents and open windows wide in the kitchen, and keep doors to the rest of the house closed.

Pressing seams and darts while you sew is good sewing practice, but it means keeping your iron plugged in for long periods of time. Try to reor-

ganize sewing projects to save ironing at the wrong times.

Personal grooming appliances such as hair styling-dryers can create a sizeable volume of warm air. Time family grooming sessions for morning and evening.


Try washing the dog and your pet rubber tree on the patio to avoid an un-essential steaming of the bathroom.

If you have a back yard pool, hang towels and swimsuits outside to dry - not inside.

Put off wall-washing, wall paper steaming and other major hot and sticky cleaning jobs until the cooler days of fall. Draw curtains or shades at sunny windows.

Set the air-conditioning thermostat at the highest level of comfort and leave it alone.

With a little thought you can defer much household-generated heat gain to the hours when your air conditioner's load is lightest.



HOW A CENTRAL air conditioning system works: A liquid refrigerant moves into evaporator coils (inside the house), evaporating into a vapor while absorbing heat from the air in the process. The cool air is blown through ducts into the house. Meanwhile, the vaporized refrigerant, laden with heat, passes to the outside compressor-condenser (at left), where it is compressed and condensed back into liquid as heat is released. Then the cycle begins again. Heat pumps cool by means of this same cycle, and then to heat the house in winter, the heat pump reverses the cycle, pulling heat in from outdoors.





## First aid for lawns

If your lawn has small purple spots, rings of dead grass or areas sprinkled with white powder, it's time for first aid.

Tiny purple spots, says Joseph Vargas, turfgrass pathologist at Michigan State University, are the first signs of a fungus disease that attacks Kentucky bluegrass during cool, moist weather. It also attacks red fescue during the warm weather in July and August.

To control the disease, Vargas recommends chemical treatment with Actidione-Thiran, Fore, Daconil 2787 or Dyrene.

Mowing to a height of two or three inches and removing the clippings will check the disease, he says.

"If you're establishing a new lawn, consider planting varieties resistant to the disease," he suggests. These include the Baron, Adelphi, Bonnie Blue and Nugget varieties of Kentucky bluegrass.

**CIRCLES OF DEAD** grass with healthy appearing grass in the center are an indication your lawn has the fusarium blight infection, the specialist says. The problem is also caused by a fungus and symptoms usually appear during dry periods. Again, Kentucky bluegrass is often the victim.

To control fusarium blight, Vargas recommends two applications of Benomyl (Tersan 1991) at two-week intervals. If applied at the first sign of the disease, this should be an effective control.

Use eight ounces of Benomyl with enough water to cover 1,000 square feet of lawn. Drench it to the root zone before it has a chance to dry on the foliage.

"Light frequent watering of infected turf will also help minimize fusarium blight," Vargas adds.

**LAWN AREAS** that look as if they'd been dusted with flour have a case of powdery mildew. Damp, shaded Kentucky bluegrass lawns are most often affected, and the Merion variety is most often affected.

To control powdery mildew, use Karathane or sulfur in combination with Benomyl every three or four weeks.

For badly infected areas, Vargas recommends reseeding or sodding with a red fescue and a resistant Kentucky bluegrass like Nugget or Warren's A34. The mixture of red fescue and Kentucky bluegrass will give you a nice looking, healthy and more disease-resistant lawn.

### Foresters help stock nation's woodpile

The woodsman who harvests timber and grows more in its place has a lot to do with the way we live and the house we live in.

The home building industry, in fact, couldn't get along without professional foresters.

It is estimated that wood is used to frame and enclose about 80 per cent of all single-family homes in the U.S. Most of the lumber used in construction comes from the country's commercial forests, lands generally entrusted to the foresters' care.

This gives foresters a critical voice in determining how best to stock the nation's woodpile for present and future homebuilding needs.

Most foresters see intensive forest management - scientific planting, insect control and efficient harvesting balanced by environmental safeguards - as the way to ensure sufficient timber supplies.

According to the American Forest Institute, it is good forest management, and professional foresters, that enable the forest products industry to produce more than one-quarter of the country's wood products from 13 per cent of the available U.S. forest base.

Helping to manage forests is only part of the foresters' job. Other concerns are watershed, wildlife and recreation, soil protection and use of forest range for livestock grazing.

## Fertilize now for rhubarb


For a good rhubarb crop next year, fertilize now, says Robert Herner, extension horticulture specialist at Michigan State University.

He recommends a technique called "sidedressing." Apply the fertilizer along the row 1 1/2 feet from the rhubarb crowns. Use 1 1/2 pounds of 33-0-0 fertilizer for every 100 feet of row,

or three to four pounds of 10-10-10 per 100 feet.

Mulch or cultivate to control weeds.

"Fertilization now gives the rhubarb a head start on storing food in its roots to carry it through winter," Herner says. "It also increases chances of a good crop next summer."

## editorial opinion

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Observer & Eccentric Newspapers endorse political candidates and issues because we believe that we have a responsibility to the general public to do so. Our editors and reporters have covered the various races, have listened to the candidates, have read their literature and press releases, and have thereby developed an informed evaluation of the campaign. It is our responsibility to bring this evaluation to the public.

Our endorsement procedures at Observer & Eccentric Newspapers are careful and thorough. We try to contact all candidates to get their

biographical sketches and pictures; in some cases, we send questionnaires to all candidates and we print those which are returned to us. We then try to interview candidates running in a race in which we endorse.

Our Editorial Board then meets to discuss the endorsements. The board consists of the executive editor and county editors, the various local editors and reporters who have covered the various campaign races, and the two co-publishers. Our endorsements, hence, are determined not by one individual but represent the informed views of our entire newspaper.

## We endorse McLaren

The major primary race in Plymouth Township is that for the Republican nomination for township supervisor. Since no Democrat is running, the winner of the GOP race between J. D. McLaren and Maurice Breen is virtually assured of election.

Two years ago, McLaren, the current incumbent, beat Breen, who was then the incumbent, in the Republican primary. (McLaren then beat Joe Krochmalny in November to win his post.)

Now Breen, in trying to wrest back his former position, is charging that McLaren has failed to show leadership in solving the township's problems while in office. Yet Breen himself admitted at the candidates' forum the township is "faced with the same problems it's always been faced with. They've always been with us and they always will be with us." He thereby destroyed his criticism of McLaren.

True McLaren has not been the "strong arm" supervisor that Breen was, but that has meant the policy-

making decisions were left to the township board which rightfully should decide on such matters (rather than leave them in one person's hands).

**WE ENDORSE McLAREN** because he has performed well in office without having to resort to tough tactics. In addition, McLaren has shown state-manship in dealing with matters in the township and with the city even at a time the city commission did not deserve it.

In the township treasurer race, four Republicans are seeking their party's nomination — Weyona Lee Fidge, Tom Notebaert, Anna Milligan and Joseph West. The winner of that race will face Democrat Janet Pierangelino in November.

While we feel all four of the Republicans stand as qualified to serve the treasurer's function as a voting member of the township board, only two are qualified to fulfill the treasurer's financial responsibilities — Joe West and Tom Notebaert, both by virtue of

their business experience.

**WE ENDORSE WEST** because of his former service in an appointive term as Canton Township supervisor and because he is in a better position than Notebaert to totally divest himself of his real estate ties. (West has said he will put his real estate sales license in escrow if elected but Notebaert, who has a broker's license, could not do so without closing his real estate firm.)

Incumbent Township Clerk Helen Richardson faces no opposition to reelection and since only two candidates are running in each party for the two township trustee seats, they have no primary battles. Running for trustee as Republicans are: Richard Gornick and Frank Millington; Democrats are Tom Sullivan and Orville Tungate.

Veteran Trustee Gene Overholt has decided not to seek reelection this time and it is unfortunate. He often provided the most rational input on matters before the board and his leaving is a loss to the township.

## Canton enters new era

The growth explosion in Canton Township has caught up with its governmental process. A new era in Canton politics begins with Tuesday's election regardless of who wins or loses.

With Supervisor Phil Dingeldey's decision to retire, the door was left open for the "new Cantonites" to take the reins.

The two most likely to ride this new political crest through the primary are Bob Greenstein and Jim Poole who are seeking the Democratic and Republican nominations respectively for township supervisor. Both Greenstein, an attorney, and Poole, a member of the township board of trustees, are far more informed on township matters than their respective opponents in the primaries.

In the township clerk race, incumbent John Flodin is unopposed in the Democrat primary and the general election.

After this year's elections, Flodin will probably be the only township board member who has seen Canton develop from its farming era to its current status as one of the county's most rapidly developing communities.

His familiarity with the township's background and his fair representation of the new Cantonites' feelings

will make him a close second in power to the new township supervisor, a position he probably should have sought.

In the township treasurer race, two challengers are fighting incumbent Grant Campbell for the Democratic nomination. Campbell had said he would not seek reelection but apparently changed his mind. He has not campaigned, responded to questions from the press nor attended candidates' forums.

Of the two other candidates in the Democratic race, Tom Stevens and Carl Parsell, we endorse Stevens because of his more extensive business background — a requisite for the township treasurer's position.

The winner will face Richard Wolfe in November — it could be a tough fight with this well qualified candidate.

In the race for the two four-year township trustee posts, three candidates are seeking nomination in each of the two parties.

Of these six candidates, BRIAN SCHWALL stands head and shoulders above the rest and probably also should have sought the supervisor post.

Schwall has consistently represented the community's new residents in a rational manner. For his continued attempts at forging Canton's identity, we strongly endorse Schwall.

Also in that Democratic race for the two trustee nominations, we endorse Bob Myers over Joe DeLauro because the former has demonstrated more awareness of township issues and has been active in consumer affairs for some time.

In the three-way Republican race for these two trustee posts, we see WILLIAM RYAN and JOSEPH KIN-NICK as the best two of the three.

There are three Democrats seeking nomination to the one two-year township trustee race — Frank McMurray, Jerry Cheske and Irene Murphy. Mrs. Murphy has not responded to the press questions nor has she appeared at candidates' forums, thus we cannot consider her a serious candidate.

McMurray has been a candidate for trustee before and was instrumental in forming the township's recreation program. For that reason we endorse McMurray over Cheske, although the latter has shown interest in township affairs too (particularly the Mocerri Project).

## Lansing, Reuther are best

There are two major Congressional battles to be fought in the Plymouth-Canton primary elections.

The first, in the second Congressional district, which includes the City of Plymouth and Plymouth Township, four major candidates are seeking the Democratic nomination to face Incumbent Marvin Esch in November. Esch is running unopposed in the Republican primary and faces strong opposition from whoever wins the Democratic primary.

**ON BALANCE** we rate Marjorie Lansing and John Reuther as highly qualified and Ronald Egnor and Dr. Edward Pierce as qualified.

Mrs. Lansing has outstanding credentials in her long record of valuable community service and her educational and professional skills.

Reuther, although a new face to Michigan politics, is well versed in the political process, thoughtful in taking positions on the issues and interested and responsive in informal conversation.

**IN THE 15th DISTRICT**, which includes Canton Township, U.S. Rep. William Ford (D-Taylor) faces no contest in his primary. But in the Republican Party, for the first time in 10 years, a battle looms. Edgar Nieten of Romulus and Jack Underwood of Westland are seeking the GOP nomination.

Nieten has displayed a reasonable and intelligent approach to national problems while Underwood failed to answer this newspaper's questionnaire.

In the 14th State Senate district, which includes Plymouth and Plymouth Township, Republican incumbent Carl Pursell faces no primary opposition.

Fighting for the Democratic nomination to run against him are Don O. Christie, a Redford Township trustee who has developed a long record of experience in the legislative process at the local level, and Michael O'Shea. Christie is his party's strongest prospect.

State Sen. William Faust (D-Westland), whose 13th district includes Canton Township, faces no primary opposition while Republican James Walsky of Canton is also without a challenger in his primary.

In the 52nd state representative district, which includes Plymouth and most of Plymouth Township, neither Republican Roy Smith nor Democrat Merian Frederick face primary opposition.

However in the 37th state house district (which includes Canton Township), incumbent Democrat Thomas Brown faces effective and spirited opposition from Robert Erwin.

Brown has done only an adequate job in Lansing but has represented his district. Erwin has shown a knack for generating ideas and providing leadership and if elected he could prove to be a capable legislator.

In the 27th Wayne County Commission district, which includes the City of Plymouth, Plymouth and Canton townships, incumbent Brian Arrowsmith is obviously the most qualified of the three active candidates seeking the Democratic nomination.

Despite his ability, we are troubled somewhat by Arrowsmith's last minute, unannounced switch from the Republican to the Democratic party. It doesn't say much for his political integrity since the Republicans now don't have an opportunity to field a candidate for the spot.

## Dusty statute of 1923 could aid civic bands

**Fred DeLano writes**

State Sen. Carl D. Pursell has unearthed a long-forgotten Michigan statute which could be used to increase our cultural wealth, being applied as it stands in Plymouth and then — with an amending touchup or two — to Livonia, Westland and limitless communities throughout the state, maybe including Detroit.

It is a statute which offers the salvation for our civic bands and orchestras and which once and for all would end the constant begging for funds to keep these units alive.

You see, the 1923 Michigan Legislature, in its infinite wisdom, adopted (and Governor Alexander Groesbeck signed) a bill which stated:

"An act to authorize and empower villages and townships of this state, also cities having a population not exceeding 50,000 inhabitants, to levy a tax for the maintenance and employment of a band for musical purposes for the benefit of the public, provided said special question is submitted to the duly qualified voters of such villages, townships or cities and adopted or agreed to by a majority vote of those participating in said election."

"The township board, village council, common council, commission, or other legislative body of any township or village of this state, or city having a population not exceeding 50,000 inhabitants, upon petition of 10 per centum of the qualified voters thereof, shall submit the question to the people as to whether such village, township or city, as the case may be, shall come under the provisions of this act and, if adopted or agreed to by a majority vote of the qualified voters participating in said election, then this act shall be in full force and effect."

"In all such villages, townships or cities adopting the provisions of this act, the legislative body thereof is authorized and empowered to levy an annual tax not exceeding two (2) mills on each dollar of the assessed valuation of such village, township or city as the case may be, for the

## Court decision eases tenseness

Cross District busing — the issue that dominated the politics of these suburbs for more than three years — ended last week, not with a bang but a sigh.

Mostly, it was a sigh of relief from hundreds of thousands of suburban families, freed by the U.S. Supreme Court's 5-4 verdict of the fear that some day some judge would order them to put their children on the school bus to Detroit.

But it was also a small, quiet sigh marking the end of an era in which men and women of good will could envisage accomplishment of a truly integrated society within a near future.

The busing plan proposed by the late Judge Roth was the high-water mark of those hopeful and perhaps naive times that produced the excitement of the civil rights movement, the reality of one man-one vote, and the flawed promise of the New Detroit Committee.

For the momentum of this surge had petered out by the time the court finally ruled, sapped by black power, white fear, and the sad realization by both that racial progress was not as simple or certain as was once hoped.

**MOST PEOPLE** in the suburbs are very satisfied by the supreme court's ruling. But in the aftermath, it is crucially important to sort out just what the ruling means and what it does not.

It does mean that, on balance, the personal ag-

## Education winner in ruling on busing

There was great joy in the suburbs last week when the United States Supreme Court reversed the late Judge Roth's decision to include the suburbs in a plan of integration of education by busing. But when the smoke clears, who will be the winners and losers in the case?

To begin with, Judge Roth did find that the Detroit Board of Education at one time systematically promoted segregation in education by busing Detroit students past the school to their homes. In other words, Judge Roth found that Detroit had overtly pursued the opposite of the neighborhood school concept.

**THE UNITED STATES** Supreme Court has ruled that, although Detroit's Board of Education may have been bad guys, there are no grounds to hold the suburbs guilty by association and that, to right a wrong, they should not be included in the overall plan.

With that accomplished, why even consider the subject of winners and losers? The answer is that there is no such thing as a free lunch and there is a price for this alleged victory.

**THE WINNER** is easy to identify. It is education.

Studies show that in situations where there

maintenance and employment, under municipal control, of a band for musical purposes for the benefit of the public."

Pursell, who is a Plymouth native, came across this dusty statute when he was asked for counsel by a local committee which went out ringing doorbells to raise \$2,500 to sustain another series of concerts under the stars in Kellogg Park by the Plymouth Community Band.

Granted, the money was raised — including a \$600 grant from the city government which put the band under municipal contract at \$100 per concert. However, this annual tin cup approach is not a satisfactory answer in Plymouth or anywhere else.

The Plymouth Symphony, Westland Symphony, Oakway Symphony and, yes, the Detroit Concert Band under the famed Leonard Smith, are among the other musical entities of great entertainment value that come immediately to mind as needing annually guaranteed financial help, without having to beg.

Here is an act already on the books which holds the answer. Senator Pursell is amenable to introducing amendments to broaden its language to include civic orchestras and to do away with the population limitation. On as non-partisan an issue as this, support should be forthcoming without political party identification from his colleagues.

The two-mill limitation could even be reduced, and wisely so. For instance, in the City of Plymouth alone under today's pattern of property assessments, a levy of just one-tenth of a mill would raise \$8,000. Half a mill, or 50 cents on the dollar, would produce \$40,000 — much more than enough to maintain both the Plymouth Symphony and the Community Band.

gravation and educational distortions that busing would have provoked were more weighty than the allegation that the suburbs produced knowingly a segregated school system in metropolitan Detroit.

What the ruling does not mean, on the other hand, is that it is now time for us in the suburbs to stick our heads back into the sand and to pretend that there are now no problems worthy of our attention.

Busing or nor, our region is still essentially segregated in housing and, thereby, schooling, with blacks in Detroit and whites in the suburbs.

Busing or no, our region is still plagued with the simple fact that the quality of education is generally good in the suburbs and generally lousy in Detroit.

Busing or no, our region is still one in which equality of opportunity is mostly available to white children in the suburbs and mostly only a fairy tale to black children in Detroit.

And busing or no, our region is still one in which the suburbs and the central city must come together in some consonance — perhaps fragile and uneasy but a relationship of some sort. For without each, the other will surely wither and die.

has been busing to achieve integration, the level of education has declined more rapidly in the outlying areas than the level of education in the core city has risen, with a net result of the total lowering of the standards of education.

The children will be educated with their neighborhood friends, and develop social as well as educational skills.

**THERE WILL** be more money for the classroom if fewer buses are purchased and staffed. And the children won't be subjected to the long hours on buses which would take time away from the classrooms.

On the other hand, the Supreme Court ruling will hasten the departure of whites from the core city to the suburbs, which will help cause the deterioration of downtown.

If downtown falls, there aren't, in the long run, going to be any suburbs.

So we have our winners but we may have our losers unless we, ourselves, are willing to break down the barriers that have a tendency to keep whites in one place and blacks in another.

## Esch votes for TV coverage of impeachment

Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) has said if impeachment proceedings are held in the House the television networks will be providing a vital national service by providing gavel-to-gavel coverage.

Esch was among more than 80 members of the House who joined in bipartisan sponsorship of a resolution which would open the House chamber to television coverage if there is debate and votes on articles of impeachment.

"I believe the American people—regardless of their opinions today about the probe as handled by the judiciary committee—want to know that justice

is done," said Esch.

"If the committee sends articles of impeachment to the House floor, the issues will be complex and television could provide a vital national service by giving our citizens gavel-to-gavel coverage."

Esch voted July 22 for a resolution to change House rules to permit live television and radio coverage of the judiciary committee's final impeachment inquiry sessions. The resolution passed 395 to 40 on a roll call vote.

"I have been greatly disturbed by the confusion, self-serving leaks and partisan bickering that followed testimony in closed committee sessions."

The congressman discounted suggestions that television or radio coverage would result in "grandstanding" by some members of the House. He said strict rules would be in effect regardless of whether television cameras were present.

Saying the House chamber would not be allowed to take on a circus atmosphere, Esch continued: "There would be no roving correspondents, no interviews on the floor. The only difference would be that millions could view the debate instead of a few hundred. The people would be direct observers of history and would have full access to all the facts."

The resolution, which would permit broadcast coverage of impeachment proceedings in the House, is now pending before the rules committee where it is in danger of being pigeonholed unless the House leadership takes action.

## Reuther fights tax loopholes

John Reuther, candidate for Congress in the 2nd Congressional District, recently urged passage of a bill that would close three major tax loopholes now used by the oil industry.

"These loopholes will cost the American Treasury more than \$6 billion in 1974," he told his supporters at Ypsilanti headquarters. "They must be eliminated immediately."

The bill is currently stalled in the Ways and Means Committee of the House. Friends of the oil industry lobby are attempting to weaken the bill by introducing a "phase out" of the loopholes rather than immediate action, he claims.

"We cannot afford to put off closing these loopholes for several years. Billions lost to oil company greediness will never be recovered. Those billions must be spent on vital domestic programs now dying because there are no funds."

The bill would eliminate: Foreign tax credit which permits oil companies to reduce their U.S. tax by one dollar for every dollar in taxes they pay to foreign governments. This will cost the treasury \$3 billion this year.

Oil depletion allowance which permits the oil companies to deduct 22 per cent of their gross income from their net income for tax purposes will cost the treasury \$2.8 billion in 1974.

Intangible drilling expense loophole designed to encourage exploration for new oil reserves, has simply given the oil barons a way to deduct all the tax benefit for drilling expenses at once. It has not stimulated oil exploration and will cost the treasury \$800 million in 1974.

"It is apparent to experienced observers that the oil industry has reaped huge profits at great cost to the American taxpayer."

"And it is evident that the powerful oil lobby is determined to kill this bill which would return a measure of justice to our income tax system."

Reuther urged the voters in the 2nd Congressional District to write Ways and Means Committee Chairman Wilbur Mills and demand action on the bill proceed immediately.

"Stalling in committee is a common method of killing or weakening a bill," Reuther concluded. "We must not permit this vital piece of legislation to die in some committee pigeon-hole."

## Lansing reports on expenses

Marjorie Lansing, contender for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 2nd District, announces she is in favor of a tougher campaign financing law than Common Cause.

She made that statement while reporting her personal assets and campaign expenses to date in the 2nd District, which includes Livonia and Plymouth.

In a recent report to the House Clerk, Mrs. Lansing announced she has spent \$16,121 in her campaign to date and pointed out that some of her opponents have spent three times that amount.

She announced her income in 1973 was \$22,652. She paid \$3,368 in federal income taxes, \$2,625 in real estate taxes and \$925 in state taxes. She owns two homes in Ann Arbor and Chelsea, purchased at a total of \$77,500 with mortgages of \$27,418.

# League booklet tells 'how' of politics

Candidates for the Aug. 6 primary, while eager to share with the public their thoughts about political issues and the monumental shortcomings of their opponents, rarely take the time to inform the public about the nitty gritty political steps that led them to prominence.

Ready and able to fill the gap in the public's knowledge about practical, everyday politics is a newly published booklet titled "The Green Grass Roots."

Published by the League of Women Voters of Michigan, this pamphlet, with its appropriate green cover, offers a handy, do-it-yourself view of politics.

DO YOU WANT to joggle the mind

of your state representative about a land use bill. On page seven you will learn that "well thought-out personal letters are the best way of communicating with your legislators."

The pamphlet also suggests that "mass-produced letters, even though personally signed, do not have the weight of a letter in your own words."

But what is the best time for your organization to make its move on an issue close to its heart?

The legislative committee is an important place for a citizen to exert pressure," the booklet says, adding several methods for exerting such pressure.

"IT IS A PRACTICAL guidebook for anyone interested in politics and government," said Mrs. Jane Watts, president of the Northville-Plymouth League of Women Voters.

"I personally would like to see it used by young people entering the political scene. As they become involved, it will be a useful resource for them."

"I think this book would give a young person confidence about participating in politics," said Mrs. June Watson, publication chairman of the Livonia league. "It tells how things are done—such as securing nomination petitions, and what steps for candidates to take when running for local office."

A league member who knows a thing or two about running for office is Mrs. Nancie Blatt, member of the board of trustees of Schoolcraft College and also a member of the Livonia league.

"THERE ARE MANY people who want to get involved in partisan politics but don't know how to do it," she said.

"People who are already active seem to assume everyone knows how to do it. This pamphlet tells eight major ways that a citizen may serve his party at the grass roots level."

"It also will be useful as a reference to someone already in politics."

Another successful campaigner, Mrs. Esther Hulsing, a former member of the Plymouth school board and a Northville-Plymouth league member believes that it is something every voter should have.

"Each voter strolling in to register should be given a copy," she said. "Some of us older voters also could be helped by learning the terminology

it uses and the steps it includes about how to take political action."

"It seems to me that it would be a valuable resource for high school civics classes. It has the kind of concise information the students need."

**CHAIRMAN OF PUBLICATIONS** for the league, Mrs. Johanne Fechter, stated:

"It strikes me that at this time in history something like this might encourage young people to participate in politics."

"So many have been turned off recently on involvement. I also feel that when they find out how easy it is to become involved, more women will run for public office."

Mrs. Watts agrees. "Recently I attended a candidates' night in Canton

Township and not one candidate was a woman."

"This booklet shows that a big prerequisite for office is interest. It would be a handy guide for any woman candidate and I hope they will make use of it. Women can bring a humanistic approach to politics rather than the cold, calculating, business aspect of some men."

**HOWEVER, MRS. FECHTER** pointed out the pamphlet might be useful to men in that it makes party structure clear, and in fact, explains the whole political system.

The 28 young musicians from Bremen, Germany, who spent a recent weekend in Livonia may have been touching American soil for the first time, but you'd never have known it by looking at them.

Or listening to them, either. They arrived in the city by bus from the Toronto airport and climbed out to meet their local host families clad in jeans or slacks, loose shirts, clogs—all the trappings that typify American teens.

Any anticipation of language difficulties disappeared with the first, "How do you do, I'm glad to meet you."

Most had had five or six years of English in school.

They are members of the Jugendkammerorchester of Bremen under the direction of Henry B. Koster. Livonia was the first concert stop for the 14 to 23-year-old musicians who are making a month-long concert tour in Michigan under the sponsorship of the Blue Lakes Fine Arts Camp.

While here they were hosted by families of the Youth Symphony Society.

Mrs. William Hamilton and daughter, Nora, were on hand to meet and welcome their two houseguests, Uta Brede and Gesa Dettmers.

Mrs. Hamilton had decided to wait until meeting the girls before deciding plans for the weekend.

She sounded them out on going sailing, explaining the family had recently bought a sailboat and although the

Hamiltons weren't expert sailors, would the girls like to sail along the shore of Lake St. Clair.

Both smiled approvingly. Gesa said that would be fine with her because, "I can sail. I have experience."

She questioned her friend in German, obviously searching for the English equivalent of "licensed sailor."

Uta, too, said she loved to sail and Nora echoed the statement and the visitors and hosts immediately found a common interest.

By the time they arrived at the Hamilton home, 18669 Levan, another daughter, Adele, a student at Schoolcraft, was practicing her violin for a concert that evening.

Uta and Gesa are violinists. Adele is also, Nora studied violin and later switched to drums and one common interest quickly grew to two as the girls compared instruments and music.

As she described the orchestra's repertoire, Uta got to a Mozart piece, added "foo-ga" and looked around for pronunciation help.

It took but a second for the light to hit Adele who came to her aid with "fugue."

Looking back on the weekend right after she had put Uta and Gesa on the bus, Mrs. Hamilton said, "It was just lovely and the girls were delightful. They were so well disciplined and easy to be with."

Friday evening the girls and the Hamiltons went to a concert at Schoolcraft by the summer school orchestra. Adele was in the orchestra which per-

formed in Livonia's "Music Under the Stars" series.

Saturday was spent sailing on Lake St. Clair in the Hamilton's 26-foot sailboat, "Carina."

The German visitors were as good as their word. Mrs. Hamilton says both were licensed sailors. "They were very helpful on the boat, they knew how to handle the ropes and we felt very confident with them."

There was excellent attendance for the Jugendkammerorchester concert at Schoolcraft Saturday evening.

Having discovered Farrell's ice cream parlor after the Friday concert, the young Germans and their new American friends went back for more confections after the Saturday concert.

Bonnie Jones of Livonia, member of the Youth Orchestra, hosted a swim party Sunday evening complete with hot dogs and typically American picnic food.

Mrs. Hamilton said her guests were "very outgoing and not at all coy about performing when asked." They told her, she said, that "in Germany to be able to perform on an instrument, particularly the violin, is an achievement."

She was particularly pleased one afternoon to find Adele, Uta, Gesa and another guest playing the Bach double concerto together just for fun.

The Hamiltons are certain their visitors had a good time.

"But it was even better for us," Mrs. Hamilton added. "We loved having them—we really did."

That split decision recently in the highest court in the land left me with pretty mixed-up emotions that must be shared by many—despite the elation generally expressed.

To explain them, I go back a little, to the integration-by-busing ruling by the late Judge Stephen Roth and the realization that the Pontiac situation I had discussed with the girls could indeed happen to us.

We talked about it again then, and agreed that while we would not really favor their having to leave familiar schools, we could understand the reasons and would follow court rulings.

But of course I found myself in the minority in these thoughts, and I guess they did, too.

And in all the anti-busing furore I had to admit many times that of course I wasn't all that thrilled about seeing my daughters in a situation like that.

It was just that I couldn't get past the words of the judge that "actions and inactions" had brought about a true injustice.

I could feel very sure that no action of mine

ever had contributed, but how about a lifetime of inaction?

Feelings grew so intense and polarization was so marked that I became honestly fearful of real trouble should school busing be ordered.

Time went on. The courts discussed busing in their legal moves and people discussed other things.

You could almost get lulled into believing the whole thing would go away.

Then matters in the background pushed to the fore again with the death of Earl Warren and the review of the historic march toward school integration.

And the "This Family will not be bused" signs yellowed but stayed in windows.

The day of decision arrived and a changed court halted the march of the last 20 years. I wish I could say I was totally displeased.

What I felt, I have to admit, was relief that my daughters don't have to do the paying for my inaction. I also wish I could know a certainty about what happens to THEIR daughters.

# The family still is rated No. 1 by most elderly people

Despite the current emphasis on retirement communities and senior citizen activities, most elderly people consider themselves first and foremost members of families.

That is the word of Jim Zalba, who works with many elderly persons as a supervisor in the federally-funded Foster Grandparent Program in Detroit. He spoke in Madonna College's Seminar on Aging, considering particularly the question of family relationships for the elderly.

"Every older person you encounter," Zalba told those participating in the seminary, "is a person with a history and a family, and that's the most important thing in his life."

He cited statistics indicating that more than 80 per cent of persons of retirement age live within an hour's drive of at least one of their sons or daughters, and 65 per cent have seen one of their children within the last 24 hours.

BUT FAMILY relationships come under many stresses where the elderly are concerned, Zalba said.

Some of these, he said, have to do with the changing status that comes with aging. Some involve today's changing society and the emphasis on the nuclear family.

Still others, he added, come from the fact we tend to lump both older people and families into one group but in fact all are very different.

"WHAT HAPPENS to a person when he reaches retirement?" Zalba asked.

"He's stereotyped" and "he's depressed" were two of the suggestions. "He's put into a new situation, and it's a traumatic shock," was another idea. "Up to the day of retirement he was expected to produce fully—then nothing."

Zalba agreed, and added: "There's a major change, because family relationship are being modified. The older person, who has been part of a nuclear family, now feels pushed out because he is no longer productive."

He said an aging parent who has been independent will at this point in his life feel a great reluctance to turn to his children for fear of being a burden.

"Thus there is a tendency to cling to the mate and if one of the partners dies the loss is even greater."

THE CHANGE IN STATUS used to be an easier transition because the extended family—grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins as well as the parents and children—was more a part of our social scene, Zalba pointed out.

"Now there are all sorts of factors, including increased mobility and the need for higher education and the tendency of young adults to separate from the family unit, that increase the loneliness of the elderly."

Zalba also suggested stresses unresolved from earlier years may cause problems in family relationships that include elderly persons.

"This is especially true when an elderly parent shares a home with the family of a son or daughter."

DISCUSSION BROUGHT OUT the idea that being old may be more difficult for a woman than a man.

"Our society tells a man he has done useful work and rewards him with a pension," one seminar participant said, "but a woman who has done housework all her life does not have that sense of worth and anyway she never retires."

Another student added: "I don't think it is at all uncommon for older women to be unable to make decisions because no one ever gave them the chance."

DISCUSSION INDICATED participants had had varied experiences in dealings with elderly people in their families. They found some wanted activity, some were content to relax, some were gregarious and others preferred solitude.

"You've made the point I wanted to make with regard to older people and families," Zalba said. "That is that there are differences in people and families and when you get older—no change."

"Yet still we keep trying to stereotype older people."

Zalba said the Foster Grandparent program helps supervise offers work for retired people who help children in institutions.

"They can work up to 20 hours a week and they are paid \$1.60 an hour. That's a stipend rather than a wage and it is not taxable."

He added the money earned often makes a great difference to the older people involved, and the human, family-type contacts often are even more important.

## Clinic will offer free Pap tests

Because cervical cancer is one of the most common types of cancer affecting women and because it is curable if detected early enough, it is recommended that women of every age have a Pap test at least once a year.

To make this possible a free Pap test clinic will be held Monday, Aug. 5 through Friday, Aug. 9 in the new Western Wayne County YWCA, 26279 Michigan, between Beech Daly and John Daly.

The clinic is sponsored by the Garden City Jayettes and the Michigan Cancer Foundation.

The clinic is open to all women. Those under 18 must have parental consent. Appointments may be made through the Michigan Cancer Foundation, Western Wayne Unit, 1112 N. Telegraph, Dearborn.

The Pap test indicates cervical cancer long before the signs are apparent. The test, a painless collection of cervical cells, takes about five minutes. The cells are microscopically examined for abnormalities.

The results will be sent to the woman's personal physician.

Irregular bleeding or unusual vaginal discharge are among the first visible signs of cervical cancer. While this does not always mean cancer, it should be reported immediately to a doctor.

Clinic chairman is Jaycette Mrs. Sandy Stolz of Garden City. Club president is Mrs. Millie Tyszkiewicz of Garden City.

Volunteers from the Cancer Foundation's western Wayne County branch will assist at the clinic.

Unity speaker

The "brain death" standard for the death of an individual was designed to facilitate the removal of organs for transplant, Dr. Bruce Miller told clergy and lay leaders at the recent 28th Great Lakes Church Leadership School at Michigan State University.

"We should all be aware of the fact," said Dr. Miller, MSU faculty grievance officer who formerly taught philosophy. "We have a situation in which we may be rushing the death of one person to prolong the life of another. It's an awesome thing."

Author of "The Justice of Judicial Decisions" and "Legal Rules and Decisions," Dr. Miller commented on other court decisions.

"The Supreme Court's decision on abortion created more problems than it resolved. It ducked the central issue of when, if ever, is abortion the taking of human life?"

**FURTHER, HE CONTENDED.** "The court was most ambiguous on the question of whether it is the pregnant woman or her physician who has

the legal authority to determine whether an abortion should be performed."

Miller called the question of whether an infant with birth defects would be saved "one of the most perplexing problems in medical ethics."

He said a frequently-given justification for not resuscitating the malformed child is that continued existence will bring the infant more suffering than happiness.

"THIS IS A JUDGMENT which we have little or no basis to make," he said. "Having known what it is like to

exercise normal human capacities, we believe that to be incapacitated would be of the utmost anguish."

"But the child does not have the experience of a normal period of life with which to compare his or her present state and conclude that it is one of great misery."

"If we are to justify not saving malformed infants it will have to be based on what the child's continued existence does to others rather than to the infant," he said.

# Wood carver donates plaque

Christ bearing his cross—all carved in redwood—hangs beside the door to the sanctuary of Faith Lutheran Church of Livonia.

The plaque is the gift of one of the congregation's members, Mrs. JoAnn Wood, who wanted her church to have a share in the talent she had developed in recent years.

"I had in mind a religious picture of this kind for a large piece of redwood I had," she explained. "I wondered if the church would be interested in having it, but I wasn't sure about committing myself until I could see how it turned out."

A telephone call to the Rev. Roger Schief, pastor of the church located at 30000 Five Mile, told Mrs. Wood that indeed Faith would be interested in such a gift.

And the work turned out well, so members of the congregation have been viewing it for several weeks now.

MRS. WOOD STARTED carving wood just a few years ago.

"I had taken art classes in high school and later studied with a painter," she said, "but the only thing I ever had carved before was a bar of soap some years ago."

"But I wanted to take an adult education course and develop a new hobby, and at the time I could go I had the choice of wood-carving or pottery."

"With little children, I decided I didn't want a lot of wet mud around."

IT TURNED OUT there was a definite aptitude for carving.

After she had studied for three terms at Bentley High School her teacher, Mrs. Loretta Hawkinson, decided to move out west to join her son and daughter-in-law.

"I really tried to find another teacher for that course, because I wanted to go on with it," she said. Her search was unsuccessful, but she was asked to take over and now is the instructor.

"I did take a course at Greenfield Village to get some more training," Mrs. Wood said.

JOANN WOOD has made a number

of carvings—statues, wall pieces, some necklaces, "anything that strikes my fancy."

She has sold a few things, but finds the market small for her particular craft. "The problem is that the value of a wood carving after it is done is so high that for many people the price is out of reach," she said.

LARGE PIECES of kiln-dried hardwood are rather hard to come by, she added.

The redwood she used for the gift to Faith is laminated. Six strips were glued together, strips were glued together.

"If you use Elmer's it makes a fine line you can accept," she said. The

redwood in this piece is deep in color, which means the tree it came from was very old, Mrs. Wood said. However, there's a thin streak of wood that's almost white—a younger portion of the great tree.

MRS. WOOD DOES her carving at her kitchen table. She says the sharp knives and chisels needed are not dangerous to handle if you are careful, and when she has nicked herself "it's because I was tired."

Her nine-year-old daughter has done a few carvings.

"They're rough, but they're there," her mother said. "The other children are just too young to handle the tools, but they like to watch and they are good chip spreaders," she added.

Comments from church-goers on the plaque have been favorable, Mrs. Wood said.

"It's something you appreciate within yourself," she added.

# Theater revises new season

## Playwriting contest offers \$3,000 prize

Final judging will be by a panel of outstanding American directors, scholars and theater critics. In addition to the first prize of \$3,000 and a premiere production, five honorable mentions with accompanying awards of \$100 each will be granted, plus consideration for production by the university theaters.

Eligible productions of the prize-winning play or honorable mentions may be entered in the American College Theater Festival, qualifying them for additional honors.

# MCA strikes gold

A \$2,109,000 state appropriation to the Michigan Council for the Arts has placed Michigan second only to New York in state funds allocated to the arts. Last year's state appropriation was \$485,000.

On a per capita basis, Michigan has jumped from 5.5 to 23.2 cents, moving Michigan from 29th among state and territorial councils to approximately 11th.

With federal and private contributions amounting to \$550,000, the MCA will have a total budget of \$2,659,000 for the fiscal year 1974-75.

IN A BREAKDOWN of the budget, \$446,554 will go to community special projects; \$184,399 will go towards com-

munity arts assistance; \$142,351 will go for community arts councils development; \$409,672 will go for critical arts needs; \$755,540 will go to the state's six major art organizations; \$359,400 will go to small and intermediate arts institutions; and \$155,549 will go to the Michigan Artrain.

In addition to those projects, \$89,145 will go for coordinated arts services; \$102,671 will go to council administration; and \$13,719 will go to non-governmental fund-raising liaison.

MAJOR CHANGES in the 1974-75 budget include the State Legislature's decisions to terminate the Michigan Artrain operations as of Jan. 1, 1975; line-iteming of funds for the major arts institutions, leaving responsibility for determining individual allocations to the 15-member Arts Council; and

mandatory approval of all grants by the MCA.

MCA Executive Director E. Ray Scott expressed concern over the legislature's decision to terminate the Artrain.

"It is difficult to understand why a program that has done so much for our state, internally and in other sections of the nation, should, without discussion or investigation, be discontinued in such a seemingly arbitrary and precipitous fashion," Scott said.

The Artrain will continue to operate for the next six months on a budget of \$155,549.

Scott also expressed the MCA's gratitude for the legislators who "helped shepherd the budget proposal through the gauntlet."

The German-American queen for this year's festival is Shelley Reidt of Warren. Her princesses are Karen Koebel of Warren and Kathy Kavanaugh of Grosse Pointe Woods.

A variety of imported articles for sale will include steins, candles, aprons, table cloths, jewelry, records, scarfs, toys, ties, dimidls, candies and baked goods.



# Redford captures Adray playoff title

## Meets Belleville Friday at EMU

All signs are "go" for the Redford Adray baseball team.

For the 10th consecutive year, Redford has dashed off with top honors in the Livonia loop and Coach Bob Atkins has to have visions of Johnstown, Pa.

Redford made short work of its three foes in the two-game knockout tourney in Livonia. After finishing first after 24 games with a 21-3 mark, Redford bounced Plymouth Bidwell, 12-0, and Royal Oak twice, 13-6, and 4-0, to win it all in the nine club league.

A 32-3 overall Redford club now sets its aim on a best two out of three tourney this weekend against Belleville. All games will be at Eastern Michigan University at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, Saturday and Sunday if necessary.

The winner of two will then move on to the regionals at Livonia's Ford Field with Birmingham, Ala. and Buffalo, N.Y. on Aug. 9-10-11 with the trip to Johnstown coming up Aug. 14.

"This club is the best balanced I have ever coached," added Atkins. "It is a good sound club and let's face it, this was the strongest this league has ever been."

"We had seven sound ball clubs and the fact alone of Westland and Garden City not even making the playoffs just strengthens this point."

"Hey, we came to play ball in the playoffs and did," said the Redford coach. "We are doing what you have to do to win. We play defense and put the ball in play and probably most important — throw strikes."

"Our keys in the playoffs had to be the scoring of 12 runs in the first inning in the three games and striking out a total of only seven times."

Opening action of the playoffs saw Redford crush Plymouth, 12-0, and Royal Oak dump Livonia Griffin behind the no-hit pitching of Scott Hornbecker.

Livonia got bounced from the tourney by Plymouth while Redford handled Royal Oak, 13-6. Then came the battle between one-time losers Plymouth and Royal Oak.

Royal Oak swept that contest and jumped back into the fire with Redford with Kevin Bara wrapping things up on the mound with a three-hit shut-out.

For the 18 year-old Bara from Belleville High, who will be throwing at the University of Detroit next spring, it was victory No. 9 in nine outings. Bara walked two and struck out six.

Bara now sports a 0.47 earned run mark in 52 innings along with 60 strikeouts.

Jamie Flynn suffered the final defeat for Royal Oak with Redford bang-

ing out nine hits, collecting four walks and going down on strikes three times.

Atkins' crew exploded for three runs in the first inning. John Roy doubled and Bara beat out an infield roller. Mark Yourchok singled in Roy and Steve Friedman sacrificed the two along where they both scored on a single by John Broder.

Royal Oak's solo threat in the finale came in the second. Joe Blugerman led off with a triple but Bara bore down and struck out Mark Clark, got Flynn to groundout to short and Kevin Smith to go out second to first.

Redford's final score came in the bottom of the second. Gary Fulks walked, was wild pitched to second, passed ball to third and scampered in on Roy's fourth hit of the contest. Roy finished with nine hits in 11 at bats in the playoffs and is now hitting at a .486 clip (49 for 101) in Adray play.

The playoff opening rout over Plymouth, 12-0, saw Atkins start with Bara but quickly yank him when he realized an easy win in progress.

Bara went just the first two innings and got credit for the win with Ray

Ivey. Gary Fulks and Jeff Moon all getting a piece of the mound action. Plymouth mustered just three hits.

Meanwhile Redford totaled 13 hits off Terry Laird, Mark Falvo, Steve Robb and Ken McLean with starter Laird taking the loss.

A six-run burst in the first got Redford rolling. After a single by Roy, Bara sacrificed him along and Yourchok singled him home. Friedman was safe on an error and Broder doubled home two more runs. Mike Kalil singled in Broder and with two out, Bill Campbell tripled and Fulks singled him home, 6-0.

Four runs on three hits upped it to 10-0 in the third. After three straight walks to Kalil, Gary D'Ascenzo and Campbell, Fulks singled in two, Bara

singled and Yourchok doubled to make it 10-0.

Redford finished up in the fourth. D'Ascenzo singled, Cambell walked and Roy doubled the two in.

The 13-6 dumping of Royal Oak the first time around saw Redford collect 13 hits while Royal Oak hammered out 14, the most ever given up by Redford this season.

John Knox, Ivey and Moon hurled for Redford with Knox recording his sixth win against one loss. Kevin Smith, Mike Perkowski and Mark Clark hurled for Royal Oak with starter Smith taking in his second loss of the year against Redford.

Paul Hunt's Franklin Berry held a three-game edge over Frayer's state prep champions with four games remaining and just let it slip away.

Franklin was blanked three straight times thus setting the stage for a position night showdown with Churchill - the winner takes all.

But Churchill did hold a slim edge heading into the finale with an 11-4 record while Franklin sat at 10-4-1. A tie would give Churchill a one-point edge over Franklin and that's just what Frayer and Co. accomplished.

The two contenders of the Blue Division fought to a 0-0 tie in nine innings before the 10:30 p.m. curfew at Ford Field in Livonia set in.

"Churchill and Franklin should never have been put in the same division to be begin with," added Frayer. "It's too bad this has to happen to a class sponsor."

"Hey, we likened this game to the Michigan - Ohio State contest," said Frayer. "We wind up with the roses and Franklin gets nothing."



## O'Shea tells views in race for House

Michael L. O'Shea of 11434 Lucerne, Redford Township, is one of two Democrats running in the Aug. 6 primary for the chance to run against incumbent Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) in the 14th Senate District. O'Shea will face Donald Christie in this Tuesday's primary. O'Shea's views on issues in answer to a questionnaire from Observer & Eccentric Newspapers follow. The questionnaire, through no apparent fault of the candidate, didn't arrive in time to be printed along with Christie's views.

ON THE bond issue for public transportation, O'Shea says he supports it

because the suburbs today have very little public transportation service.

"I am in favor of a transportation bond issue, provided each city or township involved had a seat on the governing board to insure the suburbs are more than tokenly involved."

On secret meetings, he said local governments have an obligation to make known all business which affects residents. "At the same time, however, there is no reason local officials should not have the opportunity to iron out their differences on the issues behind closed doors, provided the outcome is made public."

THERE IS A great need for strong land use legislation, O'Shea contends.

"The state must regulate the use of land in the building of housing, shopping centers, and industry. Private interest groups must be bound by strict regulations to prohibit them from using land for their own selfish gains at the taxpayers' expense."

When asked who is to blame for seg-

regation in the suburbs and what should be done, he replied: "No one is responsible for segregation in the suburbs. It is a situation which has evolved over a period of time. The state should not interfere in this so-called problem."

O'Shea's political hero is Eugene McCarthy. "It was not for his views or feelings on the issues he represented, but the fact the man had the courage and convictions to fight for what he believed right."

## Road repair problems aired

At a Ypsilanti campaign rally hosted by Mary Ann Hause, 2nd District congressional candidate Ronald W. Egnor proposed the federal government provide funds for maintenance of existing streets and highways instead of funding only new construction.

"The federal government now pays 90 per cent of the cost of construction of interstate highways and about 70 per cent of the cost of many state and other secondary roads," Egnor said.

"Yet once construction is finished local government is faced with the enormous burden of maintenance costs."

"The condition of the roads in this area speaks for itself. Take a look at Geddes Road between Prospect and Ridge Road in Ann Arbor. While the city council talks about selling bonds, the holes get deeper."

Last year, he explained, Congress introduced funding for what it called Urban Systems. When signing the bill Nixon said states and localities for the first time "will have the flexibility they need to set their own transportation priorities."

"This fiscal year \$850,000 has been appropriated for Ann Arbor-Ypsilanti according to the State Highway Dept. Seventy-two per cent of that figure is from the local governmental unit."

"Here's the catch. The funds can only be used for designated main arteries—and again, the money is only for new construction. It won't pay one cent for road repairs."

"This year, especially, more people are spending more time closer to home. This is where our priorities lie. Why should billions of dollars of our tax money be poured into elaborate Interstate Networks when the street outside the house is full of potholes?"

## Reuther says inflation is Nixon's fault

John Reuther, candidate for the Democratic nomination in the 2nd Congressional District, has blasted the Nixon administration for allowing "the worst inflation since World War I, both in terms of intensity and duration."

Reuther made the remarks recently at a meeting on his behalf at Local 157 of the United Auto Workers.

"The Nixon-Esch response has consistently been that inflation can only be controlled by putting the consumer through the wringer," Reuther said.

"Their policy is one of cutting the average citizen's purchasing power in the hope that a halt in buying will stop the inflationary cycle. This policy has produced the highest interest rates since the Civil War."

"The resulting loss in real income has forced all but the wealthy to forego everything but the basic necessities. Not only have those policies been unnecessarily harsh, but they have failed to stop the inflationary spiral."

SAYING THAT Nixon has put his personal political interests ahead of the interests of the American people, Reuther mentioned five policies which he claimed contributed to the inflation problem.

"Through the Russian wheat deal, Nixon gained diplomatic acclaim, a few speculators made huge profits, all at the expense of the American consumer."

"Because of the milk deal, \$500 mil-

lion in higher milk prices are paid by the consumer in exchange for campaign contributions.

"Nixon's farm policy, which is supported by Esch, last year paid farmers \$4 billion not to grow crops. It cost the consumer \$5 billion."

"His energy policy allowed gasoline prices to double, producing record profits for the oil industry and empty pockets for the consumer."

"Nixon's anti-trust policy, or lack of one, has allowed monopolistic or near monopolistic practices to go virtually unchecked. As a result, we as a nation pay at least \$50 billion in inflated prices."

REUTHER CALLED the ITT case "the most blatant example of how the administration has refused to adequately enforce existing anti-trust laws."

He said Nixon's chairman of the Council of Economic Advisors recent-

ly placed the blame for inflation on the American public because it rejected tax increases.

"I think it is time the administration starts looking at the failures of its own policies and providing the nation with some constructive leadership in dealing with this terrible problem of inflation," Reuther concluded.




It might be called summer complaint, though it is not connected with the usual ailment suffered in childhood when his stomach rolled and rattled and his head ached.

Those days are gone now but the memory of them causes a deep yearning for their return. And it is this yearning that causes the annual summer complaint.





## Voters will be electing more Juvenile Court jurists

Wayne County voters will add two judges to the juvenile court bench in this year's elections.

The county board of commissioners recently voted to place two additional probate judgeships on the Aug. 6 primary ballot, with the expressed understanding they would be assigned to juvenile court, a division of probate court.

The board acted the day after a bill was signed into state law — giving the county authority to increase the probate court bench by as many as four seats. A special board meeting was called May 23 because candidates face a June 18 deadline for filing nominating petitions.

COMMISSIONERS decided to add only two seats after being told by Presiding Probate Court Judge Willis Ward that the court's docket is current and only juvenile court needs more help.

The main probate court bench has six judges. Juvenile court has one judge, James H. Lincoln, and seven lawyer-referees.

Lincoln told commissioners additional judges are needed rather than the referees because U.S. Supreme Court-imposed procedures must be handled by judges.

In recent years, the Supreme Court has extended to juveniles many rights of adults, including the rights to court-appointed counsel and jury trials. "Instead of pleading their clients guilty, the attorneys are asking for trials, trials, trials," Lincoln told commissioners.

Judge Ward said it may be necessary to expand the probate court bench in the future because the Supreme Court is expected to impose new requirements for commitment hearings for mental cases.

Probate judges receive a \$36,330 annual salary.

Five new Wayne County Circuit Court seats also will be filled in this year's election.

COMMISSIONERS also directed their lawyers to intervene on the side of the defendants in a court suit which could affect mentally ill and retarded children throughout Michigan.

"Jane Doe vs. Michigan Department of Mental Health" is a lawsuit asking the Wayne Circuit Court to require a probate court hearing before a child may be committed to a state institution for treatment.

Also sought is a writ of habeas corpus ordering that all children "being held" in state institutions without their consent or with a court commitment order be released. At present, parents may have their child committed for treatment.

The suit also asks the court to prohibit "medical experimentation," including routine tests, on children in state institutions and to require public access to records of experiments or research involving the children.

The Michigan Association for Emotionally Disturbed Children already has been granted leave by the court to intervene in opposition to the plaintiffs' demands.

County Commissioner Paul Silver (D - Detroit), who proposed that the board oppose the plaintiffs in court, said object of the suit is to place par-

ents in the position of being adversaries of their children.

"Poor parents should be able to have their children admitted to a state institution for the same tests which affluent parents can have done by their own doctor," Silver says.

John J. McCann, an assistant county corporation counsel, told the board that some areas of the suit aren't likely to be disputed. "No one in this case feels there should be experimentation with the children, with no public knowledge of the experiments."

**READING, CORRECTING AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES** - Regular Meeting, July 9, 1974. Mr. Ash moved that the minutes of the regular meeting of July 9, 1974 be approved as submitted. Supported by Mrs. Holmes and carried with Mr. Burke abstaining as he was on vacation during the July 9, 1974 meeting.

**READING, CORRECTING AND APPROVAL OF BILLS** - Mr. Ash moved approval for payment of bills in the total amount of \$45,345.38. Supported by Mr. Overholt and carried unanimously.

**OLD BUSINESS** - Brender-Hamill & Associates Inc. Re: Storm Drainage for Ann Arbor Road-Approval to advertise for bids. Mrs. Richardson moved that the Township Engineer be authorized to advertise for bids to be opened at the September 10, 1974 meeting. Supported by Mr. Burke and carried unanimously.

**Web Kincaide, D.P.W. Superintendent** Re: Report on Visual Inspection of Clemons Drive Sanitary Sewer and Report on the five who failed to respond to the inquiry. Mrs. Richardson read Mr. Kincaide's letter wherein he stated that of the five, no responses, three did not want to hook up to the sewer, one wished to and he was unable to contact the fifth person. Mr. Ash commented that under Public Act No. 288, House Bill No. 6259 of the State of Michigan that, provided notice is made to the residents, the residents must hook into the sewer within 18 months. Discussion followed as to whether or not to force people to connect to a sewer. Mr. Burke commented that there does not seem to be an outstanding need for a sewer in this area for the amount of money involved. Mr. Ash moved that this item be tabled until further notice. Supported by Mr. Millington and carried unanimously.

**Brender Hamill & Associates Inc.** Re: Report on studies made on the seven combination sewers. Mr. Overholt moved that this item be tabled until next meeting, August 13, 1974 to allow the Board members to peruse the study. Supported by Mr. Millington and carried unanimously.

**NEW BUSINESS** - Richard Gornick, Secretary, Plymouth Township Planning Commission. Re: Action taken at their meeting of June 19, 1974 and July 18, 1974. Re-zoning of approximately 40 acres on the N.W. corner and 40 acres on the N.W. corner of Joy and McClumpha Roads from R-1-H to R-1-S. (Planning Commission gave recommended approval, with 7 reasons given for consideration).

Mr. Ash informed the Board that the MacComb Corporation is planning a Residential Unit Development, with parks in the interior, on both sides of McClumpha Road, and that Wayne County Road Commission is requiring the MacComb Corporation to pave all of McClumpha Road within the boundaries of their development and extend the pavement along Joy Road up to their entrance drive. The lots will face along McClumpha with some of the lots facing along interior roads as well. Mrs. Holmes moved approval of the Planning Commission's recommendation that the 40 acres on the N.W. corner and 40 acres on the N.E. corner of Joy and McClumpha Roads be rezoned from R-1-H to R-1-S. Supported by Millington and carried unanimously.

**Brender Hamill & Associates Inc.** Re: Approval to award the Minehart Water Main Contract to Peter Basile and Sons (Awarded prior to H. Wilson and Co., who went bankrupt.) Mr. Millington moved that Mr. Morgan, Township Attorney, be authorized to render an opinion to the Township Board as to the position the Board should take, and said opinion to be rendered prior to the August 13, 1974 meeting. Supported by Mrs. Holmes and carried unanimously.

**J. D. McLaren, Supervisor** Re: Requesting Board to consider Bureau of Taxations suggestion to collect 1% Collection Fee on All Tax Bills. Mrs. Holmes moved that the Supervisor notify the Wayne County Bureau of Taxation that the Township of Plymouth would request the 1% collection fee be added to all tax bills. Supported by Mr. Overholt. Mrs. Holmes stated that publicity should be started so that the public is notified of the difference between excess of roll and the 1% collection fee, and that this bill would be a separate item on the tax bill. Informing the public and making them aware would be advantageous. Mrs. Richardson asked the Observer reporter who was present to contact Mr. McLaren and Mrs. Holmes to obtain the facts to put in the paper. The motion carried unanimously.

**James Briggs, Chief Building Inspector** Re: Progress Report on Grading - L&D Service, Ann Arbor Road. Mrs. Richardson read a communication from Mr. Briggs regarding the progress the L&D Service Station has made, stating that considerable grading had been completed and much dirt had been removed, however, a Grading Certificate could not be furnished as the top of the fill near Ann Arbor Road had not been lowered to the level approved by the Township Board.

Mr. Briggs also stated in his letter that Mr. Richardson of L&D Service would like the regrading job to be considered completed except for slight modifications required by Mr. Briggs. Mr. Millington stated that after visiting the site he felt it looked good and that Mr. Richardson would do whatever the Board wishes, however, if Mr. Richardson took two feet off the top he would undoubtedly be required to later put the two feet back on.

Mrs. Tivador Balogh, 49800 Joy Road, stated that she realizes there are two sides to everything but cannot understand why illegal fill is allowed to remain. Mr. Millington stated he agreed with Mrs. Balogh, however, once the fill is in it cannot come out, which is his opinion and the opinion of the Township Attorney.

Mrs. Richardson commented that she agrees that the ordinance could be considered ambiguous and not perfect and that the new Ordinance requiring land fill is going to be spelled out more specifically. In the case of L&D Service it is behind us and we want to go from this point on and arrive at a solution to the problem which will be mutually satisfying - everyone must give.

Mrs. Chiatals, 55325 Ann Arbor Road, (four houses west of L&D Service) commented that the property adjacent to theirs had concrete and stumps put in and even though it was stopped, the concrete is still there because they can see that L&D does not have to move theirs so they aren't going to either.

The property referred to at one time belonged to a Mr. Dumbrowski. Mrs. Chiatals went on, and the concrete which was put in has caused a drainage problem and even though it is a natural waterway it has been plugged up, and backed up on her property. Mrs. Holmes moved that the Township Board accept the grading as is and give L&D Service an extension of time until September to do their seeding and planting to avoid the summer drought and heat.

Supported by Mr. Overholt, Mr. Millington felt that the Board should know what the grade is going to be, should it be dropped two more feet or not. Mr. Ash commented that although he feels the site has been improved he is not in favor of relaxing any further, that what was installed was far in excess of what was required. Mr. Millington commented that when he talked with Mr. Richardson, Mr. Richardson said he was willing to take two feet off if he were assured he would not be required in the future to put it back on.

The Motion failed. Mr. Millington asked what the law states regarding building above or below the road. Mr. Hamill replied that normal practice was to build above the road so that water would drain onto the road, however, he knew of no law requiring this. The motion being defeated, Mr. Briggs will be advised that L&D must abide by the original plan. Mr. Overholt moved that the Building Inspector be directed by the Board to investigate the property adjacent to Mrs. Chiatals to find out if the water course is obstructed and to give the Board a recommendation on whether that fill should be removed. Supported by Mr. Burke and carried unanimously.

Mrs. Holmes moved for adjournment, supported by Mrs. Richardson. Supervisor McLaren adjourned the meeting at 9:53 P.M.

## Esch bill seeks throwaway ban

U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) has proposed a bill to ban the sale and shipment of non-returnable beverage containers in interstate commerce and all flip-top cans in an effort to conserve energy wasted each year in the production of throwaway bottles. The ban would go into effect three years after enactment of the law.

While other bills have been proposed to enact the ban six months after enactment of the law, Esch believes there should be a phase out period of three years to "ease the economic impact on the consumer, manufacturers and retailers."

Sen. Mark Hatfield (R-Ore.), chief sponsor of a Senate measure to enact the ban in six months, recently said he would support the phased approach. The Nixon administration has also said it would support a federal ban if phased out over several years.

Enactment of this legislation "would not only assist us in saving energy, it would also be a major step in the battle against litter, which imposes a considerable burden on states and local communities," said Esch.

## Rebirth of Old Village

*With flower beds, trees, paint and imagination*

They used to call it "Lower Town," the eastern end of the city of Plymouth.



# Turf Tips, Quips

There may be a question in the minds of some persons about the legality of Sunday racing but from our angle it appears as if the runners will be going as many Sundays as Hazel Park management prefers to operate.

The supposed weakness in the amendment to the racing act which made Sabbath races legal in the state of Michigan was checked more than once earlier in the year. The answer was always the same. Sunday races are okay if the racing commissioner grants permission. This was granted at Hazel Park.

However, there are still some in Lansing who won't believe the amendment is legal until Attorney General Frank Kelley fixes his name on an opinion to that effect.

**THE LATEST WORD** we have is that Kelley will ink an opinion some time this week. If it follows the unofficial opinions handed down in early June, then there will be Sunday racing as long as the Hazel Park management thinks it is worth while.

They must have thought it after the state's first Sunday races when more than 13,000 passed through the turnstiles and wagered slightly more than \$1,100,000.

That meant to members of the mutual clerks' union they would be paid at the rate of 1.75 time instead of double time. However, all seemed happy enough.

Just for the benefit of those who like to dabble in figures and statistics, Hazel Park handled well over \$800,000 Friday, \$1,280,000 on Saturday, \$1,100,000 Sunday and came right back with \$827,587 on Tuesday. With those kind of stats the track can afford to have the wagering drop below \$1.2 million on Sunday. It appears things are going well despite the loss of the first two days by the strike of the mutual clerks.

**WOLVERINE** Raceway had the only game in operation in the area Monday and wound up with a crowd of 6,772 sending \$636,900 through the wickets. Thus far the per capita has been below the \$100 figure at the Livonia mile track but Vice President and General Manager Dick Wilson believes the betting will climb close to

that figure when the remaining major stables check in. They should be in stalls by the end of the week.

Inquiries are coming into the Wolverine offices about the annual renewal of the historic Motor City Pace which is scheduled for Aug. 9 ... that's just a week away on Friday.

Earlier, Racing Secretary Bill Connors predicted the Motor City could be one of the best races during the early weeks of the Wolverine meeting and it appears he knows of what he talks. The entry list includes many of the nation's fastest and best pacers, some of which should be at the track for the weekend programs.

**ED O'HARE**, the Livonia industrialist who has been making a success of harness racing, switched drivers and trainers with the start of the Wolverine meeting.

Clyde Snook, veteran of the harness racing wars for more than 25 years, took over O'Hare's stable ... would you like to believe he won his first start for his new boss, well he did.

Harness racing's longest current winning streak remains intact. Handle With Care, the remarkable three-year-old Meadow Skipper pacing filly, won her 24th consecutive race and remained unbeaten in her two-season career when she captured the Grand Circuit filly stake recently at the Greenwood Park track in Toronto, Ontario.

The filly was clocked in 2:03 for Billy Haughton and whipped Lantern and Swift Baroness.

**IT JUST CAME** to our attention a day or so but there is one politician in Michigan who will be a bit more cautious about waving to the home folks at such "dangerous" places as the county fairgrounds.

After the final heat of the Coon Memorial at the Crosswell, Mich. Fair, a screen drag hitched behind an automobile and extending out about two feet on each side of the car, came zooming past the stands just as the local

state representative stepped out to wave at the driver ... and he didn't notice the extra width of the drag.

It upended him and cut his leg, tore his pants and wounded his dignity, but he didn't suffer any serious injuries. Just anonymity regarding any publicity.

**SPEED WAS THE ORDER** of the evening last Saturday at Wolverine Raceway when a crowd of 10,436 viewed the first sub 2:00 mile of the four-night-old meeting. That and a lot of other races close to the magic clocking.

Greg Wright, the brilliant Canadian reinsman, was the first to crack the barrier this season at the big mile track. He guided Ohio-owned Swings Lady to a 1:59.4 clocking in the Club Lido pace.

County Kef, Michigan's three-year-old king of 1973, was caught in 2:00.1. Erianas Valley, owned by Livonia auto dealer Bill Brown, in 2:00.4 and Ardens Rader in 2:02.1.

With speed like that it came as no surprise when the \$7,500 invitational pace ended in a dead heat between Easy Irv and Huff N Puff in 2:01.1.

Bea Farber, of Brighton, brought Easy Irv through on the inside to dead heat with Huff N Puff in the final stride. The latter was handled by Merritt Dokey.




