

Ann Arbor Road widening set to begin

PLYMOUTH—The long-awaited widening of Ann Arbor Road was scheduled to begin today (Monday) as final contract problems were being ironed out between the State Highway Department and the contractor on the job, Thompson-McCully, of Belleville.

The \$3 million job will involve the widening of Ann Arbor Road from Hines Drive in Livonia to just east Sheldon Road in Plymouth Township. The two lane blacktop road will be widened to five lanes, with completion expected before frost sets in the fall of 1975.

Initial work on sewers and catch basins was to start today or tomorrow by Mole Construction of Romulus a sub-contractor on the job.

The first real traffic interruption should come sometime immediately after Labor Day when the road will be blocked off to through traffic between Lilley Road and Main St. The roadblock, is necessary to allow the construction of a bridge or, more correctly, a box culvert, over Tonquish Creek.


After the sewer work is done, the contractor is expected to begin the widening work by putting in curbs and gutters on the north side. Traffic will be maintained by paving the south shoulder of the road.

The contract allows Thompson-McCully 200 work days to complete the job.

Fred Wilkerson, superintendent for Thompson-McCully, said that the bridge or culvert work had been subcontracted but that his firm would do the balance, including excavation and paving.

The widening contract does not include the bridge over I-275 which opened within the last two weeks. The bridge has only two lanes open with another two still under construction.

Officials from the City of Plymouth and Plymouth Township hope the widening will improve the appearance of Ann Arbor Road—a road that has attracted several new businesses in the last few months including two restaurants, a shoe store, a bicycle store, and several fast food places.

Little progress seen in school negotiations; salary scale big issue

PLYMOUTH—Negotiations between the Plymouth schools and the teachers' union, the Plymouth Education Association (PEA), resume Thursday, Aug. 22 with little indication from either side that a settlement is near.

In the meantime, teachers have been asked to report to their assigned buildings on Aug. 29, two days before the Labor Day weekend. Before they report to their buildings, however, teachers will attend an 8 a.m. general membership meeting at Salem High School auditorium.

Traditionally teachers are asked to report the first day after Labor Day but the contract now being negotiated calls for a two week Christmas vacation. To get it in, teachers must start Aug. 29.

Norman Kee, administrative assistant for personnel, said the school board's current offer "would put Plymouth teachers' salaries at about the fifth or sixth best in all of Wayne County."

He said salary settlements showed Riverview, Belleville, Grosse Ile, Detroit and Livonia at the top.

While bargaining guidelines do not allow him to release exact figures, Kee said salaries in the top districts for master degrees after 10 years at Riverview were \$19,620; at Belleville, \$19,395; at Grosse Ile, \$19,204; at Detroit \$19,100, and at Livonia, \$19,143. Livonia's salary is based on an estimated cost of living allowance of five per cent.

"We think our offer is very good. We don't expect teachers to strike—it's the last thing in the world we want," Kee said.

Kee also noted that he hopes the board's position was being made known to the teachers. "Some of them have been saying to me they are not sure what's going on."

On the teachers' side of the bargaining, Al Nurmi, a member of the PEA bargaining committee, said that whether or not Plymouth's salaries were fifth or sixth "depends on what the board and the teachers agree on. The board can say we will be the first in the county in salaries but until it is in a contract it's meaningless. It all depends on the final settlement."

Nurmi said the failure of the teachers and the board to reach an agreement in time to save the year round school plan (45-15) in July "bodes bad for a settlement."

Nurmi said that "July was September" and that the board had been very firm on all issues.

"They sacrificed 45-15 willingly. We wanted 45-15 but we also wanted a reasonable settlement. So we have to be realistic; you don't have to be a great philosopher to see how this could come out."

Nurmi said he did not want to paint a bleak picture to the public, and noted that several bargaining sessions could be scheduled after the one on Aug. 22.

He added that it was quite possible that the teachers would have to meet outside of the school system on Aug. 29 and would rent the Plymouth theater, the Penn. He could not confirm that the PEA had rented the theater for sure, however.

Nurmi said he felt the PEA had been keeping its membership informed. He noted they sent a letter to all teachers advising them of the Aug. 29 meeting ahead of the letter sent by Supt. John M. Hoben. Hoben's letter went out Aug. 12. Both Hoben and

Kee said that the agreement to begin two days earlier was made in June and that both sides wanted it.

"We expect the teachers will hold to it," Hoben said.

The teachers struck the school district in 1969 and that strike was finally settled in Washtenaw Circuit Court. Two years ago the teachers went back to work without a contract and talks did not end until October.

It is thought that both sides are seeking a two year contract this time as well.



Bennett appeal denied by State Supreme Court

PLYMOUTH—David L. Bennett, convicted murderer of the wife of Michael Berry, Wayne County Road Commission chairman, has been denied a motion for a new trial by the Michigan Supreme Court.

In a one-sentence statement, the Supreme Court ruling reads:

"On order of the court, the application for leave to appeal is considered, and the same is hereby denied, because the appellant has failed to persuade the court that the questions presented should be reviewed by this court."

Last April 30, the State Court of Ap-

peals had denied an appeal for a new trial which had been filed by Daniel Burrell, attorney for Bennett.

Burrell had requested a new trial from Circuit Judge George E. Bowles earlier. This was denied by the judge in January 1973.

The plea for the new trial was based on remarks made about items not in evidence and the method of impeding the jury.

Bennett had been sentenced to life in Jackson prison in November 1972. The youth, then 17, was arrested May 9, 1972, a few hours after the body of Vivian Berry was found stabbed to death in the garage of her Plymouth Township home.

Bowles, in denying a new trial, had said the only new basis in the supplemental motion for a new trial was impeding of the jury.

"Argument by counsel is that the removal of the jurors, or more specifically, their separation, was not in accordance with the statutes or rules and thus the defendant was denied equal protection and due process under federal and state constitutions."

Explaining the method of choosing the Bennett jury, Bowles said:

"Defense counsel concurred in the procedure and at no time made an appropriate motion challenging the procedure favorably commented upon."

In upholding Bowles' ruling, the State Court of Appeals said the defense charge that exhibits by the prosecution "were objected to as evidence until such time as proper tracing has been made." The court ruled they were shown to have been connected with the crime and with (the) defendant.

"We hold that error was not committed when the trial court admitted the exhibits at issue."

The defense had argued that a number of items, including a gold shirt, belt, trousers, boots and a T-shirt, which had been taken from Bennett while he was at the State Police crime laboratory in Plymouth were not properly traced to the defendant and should have been excluded.

The State Court of Appeals said, "The trial court and counsel had a side bar discussion off the record and the trial court, pursuant to the prosecutor's motion, received the exhibits at issue."

"No objection by defense counsel was made at that time, but a motion to suppress was made at the conclusion of the people's case."

It's conclusion read: "We have found no deviation from sound and accepted trial procedure or established case law."

Bennett's attorney, Burrell, was out of town and unavailable for comment as to what the next move might be.

Crespo, a foreign language teacher at Plymouth-Salem.



Old price list good reading for the thrifty

A shirt for \$1. A pair of pants for \$1.29. Fifty cents for a couple of neckties, and the same price tag on a blouse.

The figures on an old sales account receipt dated Aug. 31, 1914, recently turned up by Mrs. Joan Pelon of Canton Township, show just how much the economy has changed in 60 years.

Mrs. Pelon found several receipts and account sheets among the papers she was putting away in closing the estate of her father, Howard William Moulton, of Littleton, N.H.

They involved purchasing by her grandfather, Harry C. Burbank Moulton, who actually was related to the famed horticulturalist Luther Burbank but bore the surname Moulton because he was adopted by a family of that name.

Also among the papers was a bill of sale for four horses. The total price was \$650.

"A young friend of ours recently saved her money for several years to buy a horse, and it cost more than that for just one."

MRS. PELON'S grandfather owned a livery stable in the New England area and, after the horseless carriage came into being, he converted to early car sales.

Also among the old effects were several photos, including a gag one that showed several carriages hitched up to an early model automobile.

She said her father and his brother came to Detroit in the early days of the auto industry "because the \$5 a day Henry Ford started paying sounded pretty good."

In recent years Mrs. Pelon has been checking more into family records and hoping to learn more about her heritage.

She definitely plans to save the old sales bills, as reminders of both her own past and a simpler economy.

"I THOUGHT THE PRICES were pretty startling compared to what we have to pay today," Mrs. Pelon said, "and the beautiful, neat handwriting and the way they kept their accounts interested me."



City bond sale OK'd

PLYMOUTH—The State Municipal Finance Commission has approved a pair of bond sales for street improvements scheduled to begin next week in downtown Plymouth.

The commission approved \$145,000 in special assessment street improvement bonds and \$165,000 in general obligation street improvement bonds for repaving a section of Hamilton Street between Union and Ann Arbor Trail, as well as other shorter sections of downtown streets.

The bonds are payable from the city's general taxes and will be used to defray a portion of the street construction.

Things looking up for 15th District GOP

Fifteenth congressional district Republicans adjourned their district convention last Wednesday at the Colonial House in Taylor on a new note of optimism. With the resignation of Richard Nixon and the ascension of Gerald R. Ford, to President Republi-

can candidates feel they are back in the race.

"We have good reason to be optimistic about the party's chances in November," said Ernest Fackler, 15th district GOP chairman. "The primary balloting clearly indicates the incumbents are in trouble."

Six veteran Michigan legislators were beaten in the August primary, the first statewide election since Watergate came into full public view. The trend seems to be toward new faces, Fackler said.

"DISTRUST of politicians presently in office has turned things around. The GOP is gaining at the grassroots level."

Fackler pointed out that Republicans control upper offices headed by President Ford, Gov. William G. Milliken and U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin.

"I feel we will see an emerging Republican vote on the lower portion of the ballot within the next 10 years," said Fackler.

The 15th congressional district, which includes Westland, Garden City, Canton Township and two precincts in Livonia, has been traditionally Democratic. Of 35 state representatives from Wayne County districts, 32 are Democrats. There are six Democrats and one Republican from Wayne County in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Most candidates believe that President Ford, being a native son, 25-year representative to Congress and representing a conservative Republican philosophy, has bolstered the party's chances to elect many local candidates.

The group, anxious to show its support for the new president passed a resolution pledging their "prayers, unity, and cooperation with the Ford administration."

DOOR-TO-DOOR campaigning was the strategy stressed for beating this

year's Democratic opponents.

James D. Walaskay (R-Canton Township), running against Sen. William Faust (D-Westland) for the 13th District state senate seat, said meeting and talking to people is the "only way to beat him."

"It's important to meet the electorate," said Walaskay, "because now that the psychological burden of Watergate is off the public's shoulders, they can sit back and evaluate the candidate and vote on the basis of issues, not Watergate."

IN OTHER ACTION the convention elected 16 delegates from Westland, Garden City, Canton Township and two precincts in Livonia to the state convention Aug. 23-24 in Cobo Hall.

James E. Poole and James Walaskay. Alternate delegates are: William T. Mast and Louis Stein.

Delegates from Garden City are: Lavaughn Wethington, Millie Shivers and Ruth Smith. Alternate delegates are: Sue Ferguson, Alma David and Marion Weddel.

The delegate from Livonia is Patricia Daberkoe. The alternate from Livonia is Clements Dragovick.

REPUBLICANS WILL nominate candidates for lieutenant governor, attorney general, secretary of state, two State Supreme Court justices, University of Michigan Board of Regents, Wayne State University Board of Governors, Michigan State University Board of Trustees and State Board of Education.

Instead of adopting a party platform, Republicans will present a list of issues to be voted on by delegates at the state convention.

Issues include busing, campaign disclosure, transportation, energy, firearms limitations, state land use plan and welfare.

Quality should be part of school talks, too

The shore of Kimball Lake, just off Northern Minnesota's Gunflint Trail, is a good spot for thinking.

If as you sit there, puffing on a stogie, it's natural that your thoughts turn to quality—particularly quality in workmanship.

I wonder how often, in these stages of negotiations between the Plymouth School District and its teachers, anyone has stopped to think about quality in educational workmanship.

Salary hikes seem to be the sole issue at the moment for both the Plymouth Education Association (PEA teachers union) and the school district. Teachers say their demanded raises are warranted (without saying whether the quality of their teaching has increased proportionately) and the schools say the budget can't stand whopping increases (also without addressing themselves to the quality of education).

HAS THE QUALITY of education in our classrooms ever once been discussed at the negotiating table? I doubt it.

Oh, it can be argued that higher teacher salaries attract more qualified teacher applicants who can contribute more to quality education, but with the plethora of job applicants these days, that argument holds less water than it used to.

Even if the argument is valid — it means quality of education comes

only as a byproduct of the negotiating process.

Currently negotiations are stalled over the monetary hurdle which tripped up Plymouth's pilot year round school program.

THE OPENING of the regular school year is not far off, and the PEA is talking about the possibility of a strike. (A vote has been scheduled for Aug. 29 in the event a settlement isn't reached by then).

Before that point is reached, though, the people of the district deserve to know what the negotiations situation is—explicitly.

Since the community must decide whether the threatened teacher strike is warranted or not, the facts must be laid bare. The last offers from both sides must be revealed.

The residents (and taxpayers) of

the district must have a voice in weighing the costs of their educational system against its quality—something the Plymouth district has been known for.

IF AN EQUITABLE settlement can be reached between the schools and the teachers in time to avoid disrupting the school year, we will be pleased.

But if a strike delays school, the people will decide—having been given all the information—whether our quality of education is worth the price.

Although quality is not a concern of the negotiators, it is for parents who send their children to Plymouth schools.

I'd suggest that the negotiations on both sides pause a bit to light up a stogie and reflect on quality a bit.




Day-care for tots now includes swimming

Now when you take your pre-schoolers to day-care center, you can also arrange swimming lessons for them. And get them there as early as 6:30 a.m. if that's what you need. Or maybe soon be able to arrange for evening care.

These innovations are part of a package offered by the newest day-care center to locate in this area. Michigan Young World, at 32503 Ann Arbor Trail in Westland, opened its doors officially Aug. 1 and expects to be going full tilt by the beginning of fall.

THE TENTH IN A CHAIN of nurseries that have been operating for several years in Lansing, Flint, Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo and Muskegon, this is the first Young World in the Detroit metropolitan area.

And its sparkling swimming pool, along with the cheery playrooms with sturdy equipment and the trained staff on hand, make it a pleasant place for a pre-schooler to spend his hours.

"This company is young in ideas as well as name and age," said Mrs. Marge Langworthy, director of oper-

ations for the chain, "and we decided to try swimming as an addition to the program in our two newest nurseries, this one and one in Flint."

DIANE GESSLER, a Central Michigan University graduate who has worked in other Young World nurseries, moved to Westland to become director of the new one.

She supervises a varied program for children from two and a half years of age to eight or 10 in the summer.

"We plan things for older children too," she said, "because children that age just aren't old enough to leave home if a mother has to work."

In the large playrooms there is a wealth of equipment, climbing toys, a slide, a doll and dress-up corner, a place for art activities.

Masking tape marks roads and railways for the toy trucks and trains, and more tape forms letters for the youngsters to sit on while teachers Carol Palk or Debbie Kania or aide Linda Smith tell a story, equipment for outdoor play is in a fenced yard.

IN THE SWIMMING POOL, where the water is kept at 80 degrees, "because the little ones seem to like it

that way," Miss Gessler says, water safety instructor Rick Wilson holds forth.

"He has had experience with all ages from infant on up," the director said, "and he's really very good with the kids."

Swimming instruction as well as free play are worked into the nursery program, with small groups of children taking turns in the water.

THE POOL ALSO is to be available for community use, said Mrs. Langworthy.

"We're thinking in terms of afternoon time for older children in the area or maybe a businessmen's time around noon or family swimming in the evening," she added.

"We have a facility we want to put to maximum community use."

More general use of the whole building also is being planned. Mrs. Langworthy envisions craft classes and special interest groups for school-age children after school and on Saturdays, and maybe some adult education classes if a need is seen.

"We'll be brainstorming to see what are the areas where we can best help

parents," she added.

YOUNG WORLD OFFERS both a full and half-day program. Diane Gessler said she had found a good cook who will begin work in the fall "and until then I'm chief cook and bottle-washer."


The cost for the program is \$6.50 for the full day, including lunch, or \$4 for a half day, with an extra 75 cents charged for lunch. The swimming lessons are \$18 for eight lessons over a two-week period, and children not enrolled in the nursery may take them.

Young World also has transportation available at 75 cents each way.

THE SCHOOL HAS its early-morning opening, said Mrs. Langworthy, "because if a nurse has to be on duty on the 7 to 3 shift she needs a place to drop the kids off early."

Evening hours have been instituted in several of the other Young World nurseries and a similar move will be made here if there is a need, she added.

The nursery, she said, is fully licensed and about half of the total number of youngsters enrolled are children of ADC parents, Mrs. Langworthy said.

The plots thicken for Schoolcraft gardeners

Project SEED has caused 289 gardens to bloom on about 10 acres of Schoolcraft College property.

Everything from the ordinary tomato to Jerusalem artichokes are making an appearance at this community gardening project, cooperatively sponsored by the Newman Center and the college.

There are many students and college employes among the gardeners. But the group also represents a cross-section of persons from many communities the college serves.

THEY RANGE in age from Mark Grote, nine-year-old son of C. Nelson Grote, Schoolcraft's president, to senior adults like Opal Rue of Livonia.

One of the plots is tended by a Girl Scout troop for retarded girls. "I have never seen such enthusiasm," said Grote, who confessed that his plot was somewhat tangled with weeds. "It is the the best public relations we could have."

AT A RECENT meeting of the board of trustees, he advised its members to walk to the garden area and inspect the work done by community gardeners.

"Some are very exotic," he claimed.

Except for providing land, which otherwise would stand vacant, there is no expense to the college for this project. Gardeners pay \$5 for plowing and to cover mailing and other minor administrative expenses.

They also sign a waiver releasing the college in event of personal injury.

THE PROJECT was launched last year when 130 garden plots, primarily 25 by 30 feet, were cultivated on 4.5 acres of college property behind the Newman house and the Gable house.

Popularity of the scheme is evidenced by the jump from 130 garden plots last year to 289 this year.

It is administered by Judy Kaltz and Sister Margaret Basso who are assisted by RSVP workers Cassie Grary and Joe Plunkett.

10th inning loss ends 41-5 season

Brooklyn sends Redford Adray home

JOHNSTOWN, PA. — Brooklyn, N.Y., pushed across a run in the last of the 10th inning to put a halt to the area's top baseball showing ever.

Bob Atkins' Redford Adray squad fell to Brooklyn, 5-4, for its second loss in a two-game knockout in the Triple ABA nationals in Johnstown.

The Redford crew, which had dropped its tourney opener to Maryland State, 7-2, and then rebounded with a 12-1 win over Mt. Pleasant, Mich., and a 13-3 triumph over Pittsburgh, now closes its 74 book with an overall 41-5 mark.

Redford scored only two runs on six hits in that opening loss but exploded in the next two games for a total of 25 runs on 35 hits including six home-runs.

THEN CAME Brooklyn, which had defeated host Johnstown earlier, 4-3. Redford outhit the Brooklyn team, 8-7, but fell a run shy for the win.

John Knox, Kevin Bara and Jeff Moon all hurled for the Redford squad. And the ending for Redford couldn't have been more ironical with Bara suffering the defeat - his first of the summer after 12 consecutive wins.

Knox went the first three innings. Bara came in the fourth, and Moon in the last of the 10th with two out and a runner on second. On a 1-1 pitch, 16-year-old Bruce Howell laced a single to left center and Redford was on its way back to Michigan.

MEANWHILE, THE only other Michigan team alive in the tourney in Detroit Adray Photo defeated Zanesville, Ohio, 5-2, to move into a bout with Brooklyn.

Redford drew first blood in the extra inning loss. With one out in the

top of the first, Mark Yourchok walked and scored on a double in the left field corner by John Broder.

Brooklyn got that one back plus one in its half of the stanza. Knox hit the first batsman he faced in Ken Corbo, struck out the following hitter and got the No. 3 hitter to ground out before Bruce Sunear drilled a 390-foot shot over the wall in right center to make it 2-1.

The third saw Redford notch up the scoring column. John Roy led off with a single and moved to second on a sacrifice by Yourchok. Roy was wild pitched to third and after Broder went down swinging, Steve Friedman walked and didn't bother to stop at

first - drew a throw at second and Roy dashed in with the second run. With Friedman at second, Mach singled but Bara popped out to end the inning.

A DOUBLE PLAY got Redford out of a jam in the fourth inning with Atkins calling on Bara to replace Knox on the mound.

Redford took the lead for the final time in the tourney in the fifth inning. Broder was safe on an error, stole second and dashed in on a two-out double by Art Mach to make it 3-2.

Brooklyn wasted no time in getting back in the contest. With two down and two strikes on the hitter, Von Al-

Iren, Bara delivered up a "gopher ball" and it was tied at three-all.

For the second straight time, a Redford two-bagger by Gary D'Ascenzo went for naught with the Adray crew failing to bring him home in the sixth.

Brooklyn tallied once in the sixth. After two were down, Bruce Sunear singled and Bara walked two to load the sacks and set the stage for a run-scoring hit by Art Rignio to make it 4-3.

It was the last-shot for Redford and the Michigan team came through to tie it at four-all. Bob Ganzak was safe on an error, Roy walked and Yourchok hit into a fielder's choice with Ganzak moving to third. Broder then

sacrificed in Ganzak to force it into extra innings.

THEN CAME the last of the 10th. Bara struck out the first hitter but Corbo singled. On a hit-and-run, Steve Friedman tossed out the hitter at first but Corbo moved down to second. Atkins then came in with his lefty Moon from Northville and Howell did his thing and Redford wound up in a tie for sixth place in the nationals.

The 12-1 win over Mt. Pleasant was win No. 1 for Redford in the tourney. Bara and Tom Miller hurled for Redford with Bara picking up the win, going the first seven innings and allowing six hits. Miller allowed two hits and one run in the last two.

Meanwhile Redford collected 19 hits off the Mt. Pleasant starter Tim Davis who went the full route for the loss.

Redford scored twice in the second on hits by Mike Kaili and D'Ascenzo and added one in the third on a homer by Mach. A walk, error and single by Yourchok pushed it to 4-0 in the fourth.

Four singles in the sixth by D'Ascenzo, Roy, Yourchok and Broder upped it to 7-0 with Redford finishing it off in the eighth with five runs on six hits.

Roy and Yourchok singled. Broder singled in Roy. Friedman delivered a 425 shot over the fence in left for three more scores. Miller and Kaili followed with hits for the final tally.

THE REDFORD BATS kept on booming in the next contest tagging Pittsburgh for 13 runs on 16 hits. Tom Nippa and Moon worked the Redford mound with Nippa recording the victory and Pittsburgh collecting 11 hits.

The first pitch of the contest saw Roy smash a waist-high fast ball over the 350-foot marker in left and the No. 2 hitter in Bara lined a 2-2 pitch over the right field wall to make it a 2-0 ball game.

A walk to Bara and homer by Yourchok upped it to 4-0 in the third with Pittsburgh scoring one in the last of the fifth to slice it to 4-1.



There's quite a story behind Springs Pride, the surprise conqueror of Invincible Shadow last week at Wolverine Raceway. The pacer is owned by the Hillbrook Farms of West Bloomfield owned by Norm Mealey and his son Richard.

Norm has been in the business for a long time and has had several better than average performers during the time. But right now it would appear that Springs Pride is the best to date since it recorded a 1:59.3 mile in whipping the great Canadian star.

Springs Pride is a Bret Hanover out of Spring Romance, a mare owned by Mealey who was a much better than average performer during her racing career. Norm has always bred his mares with the best stud available at the time, and he couldn't have picked a better one this time. Bret Hanover is rated as one of the top stallions in the land at the present time, and Norm must have paid a pretty penny to make arrangements for his mare to go to Bret Hanover.

SPRINGS PRIDE, a six year old, shows earnings of more than \$90,000 at this time and probably will pass the \$100,000 mark within another race

or two. It has banked \$30,000 this year.

There was a time a few years back when Richard had visions of becoming a driver-trainer. That was when he was in his early 20s and had all of the vim and vigor necessary to get around the track at 6 a.m. and still be there after the races at midnight.

Richard was being taught by Pat Bellows at a time when there were quite a few young drivers learning the trade at Wolverine Raceway. He got to the point where he was second trainer in the stable and then gave it up to take over an auto dealership acquired by his Dad.

But he never lost his interest and was the first one in the winner's circle after Springs Pride upset Invincible Shadow. Wouldn't you know that Norm had picked this time for a vacation and didn't see one of the greatest victories by a horse from his stable?

It proves a point that many Michigan harness horsemen haven't learned yet. Speed from the dam and the sire often produces a standout horse. But if one is going to take a nickel mare to a million dollar stud,

the chances are the offspring will be worth a nickel.

FEW MICHIGAN owners are willing to pay the price, probably because a big fee for stud service doesn't necessarily mean an exceptional race horse. It may not be worth even a plugged nickel and on the other hand it may be another Albatross. Who knows? Remember there was a time when Albatross was up for sale at Hazel Park for less than \$10,000 and there weren't any takers.

That's why it's nice to see an owner like Norm Mealey profit on a risky investment. We know one owner in Livonia who paid \$5,000 for service from a famed stud standing in Kentucky. He wound up with a beautiful trotting colt. . . then he discovered the colt could trot but hardly enough to become a standout.

THE CURRENT Hazel Park meeting will go down in the record books as one of the most successful as far as business is concerned and one of the roughest on the five-eighths mile track.

Imagine, if you can, a thoroughbred meeting where an objection is filed in

one of every 10 races and you have some idea of what's taking place.

Glenn Brogan, who appeared a cinch to win the jockey title, was set down twice in the first 20 days for roughriding. The two suspensions just about eliminated him from the race where Sam Maple is building up quite a lead.

Then there was the accident last Friday in front of the stands when four horses collided and went down. Fortunately none of the riders was hurt seriously although it appeared for a time as if it could have been a real bad one.

Regardless of what takes place on the track, the east side track is still averaging a million daily and that's the best of any Michigan track in several years.

Part of the success is due to big days on Saturdays and Sundays but strangely enough the wagering is holding up on weekdays much better than anyone supposed.

PACERS AND trotters from the area covered by the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers Inc. are paying their way at Wolverine Raceway these nights.

For instance, veteran Don McMurray, who resides in Farmington, drove three consecutive winners, two of which were catch drives when the regular pilots didn't get back from the county fairs in time for the assignments.

Don started his streak in the sixth when he guided Lincoln's Bonfire to an easy win for \$15.20 payoff. He was filling in for Wilbur Beattie.

Don came right back in the seventh and won with Clem Creed in a tight finish over Ohio State. This time it was a long shot and paid \$41.60.

Just to keep the bettors on their toes, Don made it three straight in the eighth when he subbed for Ned Simmons and drove Steve N.Z. to a length victory for a \$17.40 payoff. Ned Simmons hails from Southfield.

Other area winners during the evening were: Jean M. from the North American Stables and Bruce Wilson of Bloomfield Hills; and Mac Farvel, J Stable and Tom Wantz of Southfield.

Schembechler's Wolverines open '74 season on Aug. 24

University of Michigan's Wolverines open preparation for their 95th football season Saturday (Aug. 24) when 80 varsity candidates plus 30 freshman report to Coach Bo Schembechler.

On that frosh roster is Dave Har-

ding who attended Thurston High School before making the jump to Detroit Catholic Central. Harding is currently living in Plymouth.

The 80 varsity squad sports just one area grinder in junior Kirk Lewis from Garden City West.

The press will receive a preview of the Wolverines on Friday morning (Aug. 23) when Michigan holds its annual picture day in Michigan Stadium. For Schembechler, this will be season No. 6. The Wolverines have won 48 games, lost four, and tied one during the last five regular seasons, and this represents the best winning percentage of any major college football team in the nation. Penn State is second with a 48-5-0 record.

The '74 season will offer a new look to Michigan football. Gone are the big, powerful fullbacks and offensive tackles Schembechler has used to carve out four Big Ten championships in the past five years.

Speed will be replacing muscle in many areas as Schembechler begins grooming the fastest backfield he has ever had, and probably the fastest in Michigan's football history.

Dennis Franklin, the strong-armed quarterback who runs the 40 in 4.6 seconds, is the cornerstone of the backfield. Twice an All-Big Ten selection, Schembechler considers the 188 pounder "The best quarterback in college football." He has run and passed for 2,288 yards in two seasons.

Beyond Franklin, the backfield speed becomes even more impressive. Gil Chapman switched from tailback to wingback, is a 9.5 sprinter, sophomore tailback Rob Lytle ran the hundred in 9.7 at Fremont High in Ohio,

while another tailback, junior Gordon Bell, is just about as quick.

Chuck Heater, the regular tailback last year who gained 1,321 yards rushing in two seasons, has moved to fullback.

Michigan's offensive line lost four starters, while the defensive line lost its entire front five through graduation. The linebackers and most of the defensive secondary are back as Schembechler has 30 letterwinners and 11 starters returning from a team that won 10 games and tied once in '73.
