Christmas spirit prevails

All city employes given pay raise

PLYMOUTH—In spite of the heat and humidity this week, members of the City Commission were gripped with the Christmas spirit and granted the city employes a two per cent increase in wages.

Under the terms of the motion, the increase will go to the non-union em-

ployes immediately and unions will be asked to open their contracts to accept the same offer.

In asking for the opening of the contracts the commission made it plain that the action was to be limited to accepting the offer of the increase—and nothing else.

The commission's action came as a surprise to the employes, as there had been no hint of what was taking place. In granting the increase, the commission stated that it was done to help offset the high cost of living and the spiraling inflation.

The increase will not affect the

budget, according to City Manager Fred Yockey, who informed the commission that the present surplus is \$10,000 above what had been anticipated and that the additional \$8,000 in the \$18,000 wage package could be taken from the special contingency fund.

With the voluntary increase the com-

mission admitted looking ahead to future labor negotiations on the theory that the employes now would realize that their interests would be considered and that some of the bitterness shown in the past would be eliminated.

The action was not without its hu-

morous side as one of the spectators in the rear of the room called out:

"Why not give the taxpayer a two per cent break, too?"

Mayor Beverly McAninch smilingly answered, "Wish we could, but it would be too expensive."

"We have been getting nothing but promises for several years," Mrs. Flossie Tonda, chairman of the committee, stated, "and now it is about time some of them are made good."

For the past several years the committee has been working methodically on a program that would insure safety of the children on the highways to and from school. To this end they have prepared a map showing every intersection in the school district and the number and kind of accidents that have happened.

After this study the committee asked for a light at the corner of Hartsough and Sheldon Road; a full signal at Ann Arbor Trail and Haggerty Road, along with flashers at Hanford Road and Sheldon.

MRS. TONDA stated that Russell Harrison, of the Wayne County Road Commission, had promised these lights and flashers and that some of them would be installed by Labor Day.

"Now, he says this can't be done," she said, "because the commission must wait on the Edison Company to do the work."

Mrs. Tonda emphasized the necessity of the lights by pointing to the study made at the intersection of Ann Arbor and Haggerty Road, where there was a 50 per cent drop in accidents from 45 to 24 in 1973 after the traffic light was installed.

The committee also has pointed out that there were 37 accidents at the corner of Ann Arbor and Sheldon Roads and a like number at Penniman and Sheldon.

"When you consider that there are from 60 to 80 children on the school buses," she said, "it is just horrible to think what could happen. That's why we need the lights and signals so badly."

One of the hopes the committee now is nursing is that the road commission will decide to pave Beck Road and take the heavy traffic from Sheldon Road.

IN THE COMMITTEE'S findings the heavy traffic from such places as the Ford plant and Western Electric, makes a hazard all along Sheldon Road.

"There are five schools on Sheldon Road," Mrs. Tonda continued, "and it is becoming more dangerous there all the time. That's why we are hopeful that a move will be made to pave Beck Road."

To advance the committee's arguments it was pointed out that there has been a great reduction in the number of accidents at the intersection of Five Mile and Northville Roads since the installation of the traffic light. This once was the worst intersection in the entire area.

With this proof of what a traffic light can do, the committee is more than hopeful that the Wayne County Road Commission now will follow the ruling of the Court of Appeals and at least install the lights and flashers that were promised for the coming year.

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City will re-submit petition to annex site in Township

PLYMOUTH—By unanimous vote Monday night, the City Commission decided to re-submit its petition to the State Boundary Commission for the annexation of the three acre parcel of land in Plymouth Township that now is the site of the Hillside Inn.

The petition included a new map showing all the bearings on the plot and met all the requirements that had been the cause of its rejection some time ago.

In the petition it was emphasized out that the plot is surrounded on three sides by the City of Plymouth and now is more or less of an island. Granting of the request, the commission stated, would eliminate the island and make the boundary line more logical.

Re-submission of the petition is the latest step in what could become the annexation of the approximately 30

acres on the north side of Plymouth Road and takes in the property that serves as the Burroughs parking lot.

A public hearing on the annexation of the larger plot has been set for Oct. 22 in the East Middle School and it is hoped that the annexation of the smaller island on the south side—the Hillside Inn parcel—will be acted upon at the same time.

The larger parcel includes the land between Plymouth Road and the railroad to the north, and from Hines Parkway on the west to Haggerty Road on the east.

In re-submitting the petition the city is pointing out that if the larger parcel is approved it will leave the Hillside Inn property as a small island surrounded on all sides by the city.

While the commission is taking noth-

ing for granted in re-submitting its bid for the smaller parcel, it was felt that the prior rejection was based on the technicality that the land bearings were overlooked in the first petition and now that this oversight has been corrected it should be approved.

Considerable interest also is being shown in the larger parcel because of the planned development that calls for a series of apartment houses, along with a huge shopping center, a theater and a restaurant site.

When this was first proposed, township officials voiced their objection to the large number of apartment houses.

Since then little has been heard, aside from setting the date for the public hearing on the city's petition to annex the entire site on the north side of Plymouth Road.

Learning program set to open

PLYMOUTH—The Plymouth-Northville chapter of the Michigan Association of Children with Learning Disabilities will sponsor a perceptual motor development gym program for four to 16-year-old children with perceptual motor difficulties.

The program will start Sept. 10 at Miller Elementary School in Canton with Patrick O'Donnell, special education teacher as the instructor.

The program is modeled after a similar program in Livonia. Children entering may demonstrate a range of problems including reading and writing difficulties, hyperkinesis, low self-image, poor coordination and auditory or visual perception problems.

Registration for the classes is being held through Aug. 31 at the home of Woodrow Barrie. Class fees will be kept to a minimum and all classes will be held on Tuesday evenings.

Sand pile caves in; 2 Canton boys die

CANTON—Two young Canton Township boys died sometime Wednesday, apparently suffocating when a tunnel in a small mound of sand collapsed.

Dead are Douglas Waddell, 11, and his stepbrother, Steve Reiker, 12, sons of Mr. and Mrs. William Waddell, Apt. 105, building 21, on 8225 Brook Park Ave. The apartments are located on Joy Road just west of the I-275 freeway.

The sand had been delivered Monday to be used as a base for a recreation area for the 500-unit apartment complex, known as Stony Brook Apartments.

According to Wayne County Sheriff's Road Patrol detectives, the older boy was discovered about 6:30 Wednesday when some youngsters playing in the area saw a hand protruding from the sand.

One onlooker said they may have

been digging a tunnel from one pile to another. Another neighbor said the two boys were always together and that news caused the patrol officers to dig deeper when the first boy, Steve, was found in about three feet of sand.

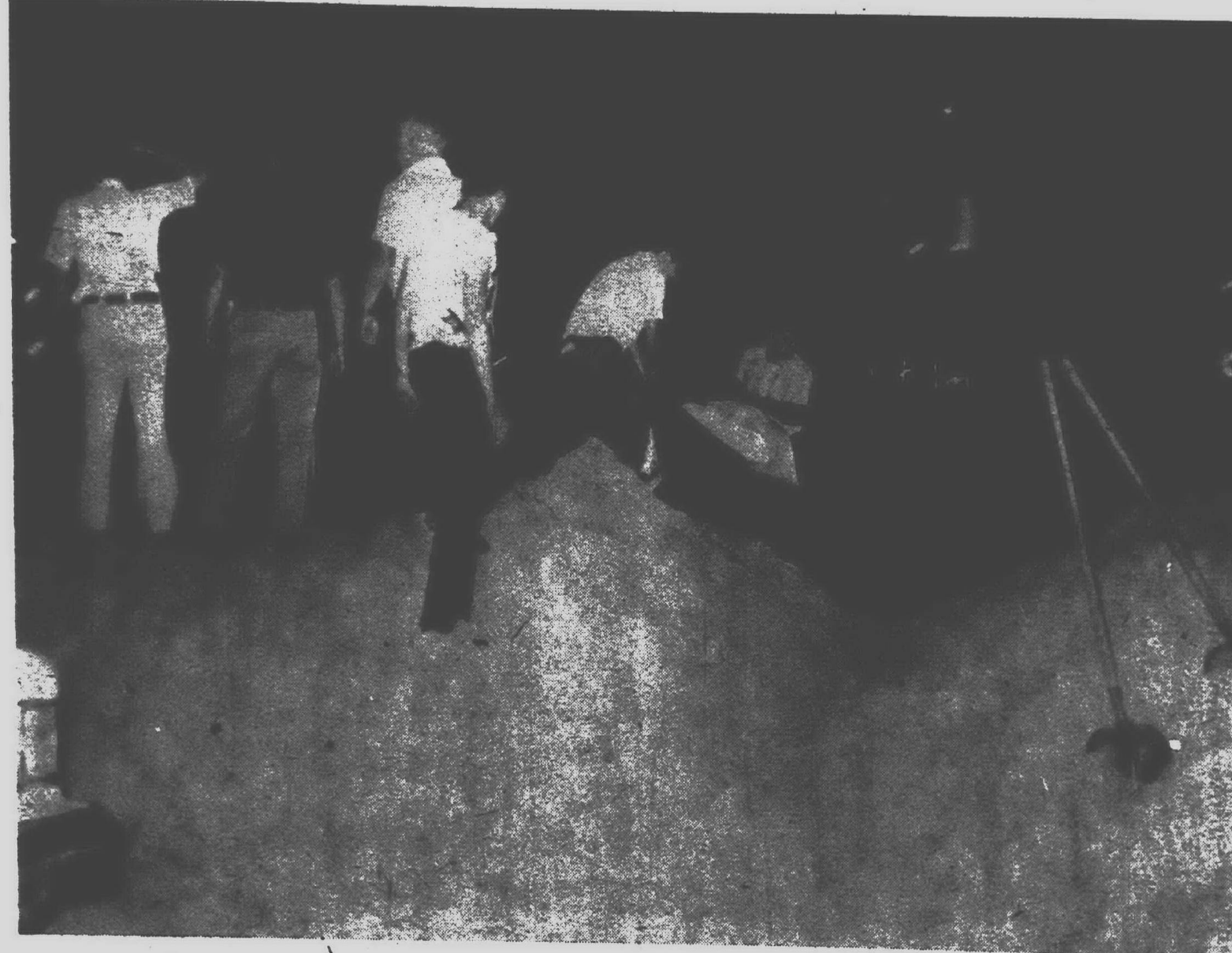
The second youngster was found in about six feet of sand, in a kneeling position as if he had been digging.

Officers said they did not suspect any foul play but would await a formal autopsy and the ruling of the Wayne County Medical Examiner.

Police say that the parents had last seen the pair between 8 and 8:30 a.m. Wednesday.

Although many youngsters had been playing in and out of the sand all day, it is not known exactly when the two youths were trapped in the mound.

The investigation was handled entirely by the sheriff's road patrol; the Canton Township fire department aided in the recovery efforts.

15th Dems are hungry for statewide nomination

The 15th Congressional District in western Wayne County has never had one of its Democrats nominated for state office, but Joan Marie Pettipren of Westland has a chance to be the first.

Known socially as Mrs. Vincent Pettipren, wife of the 15th District Democratic chairman and former state representative, she is seeking one of two nominations for the State Board of Education. Vince is providing a lot of campaign help.

Her chief problem is that another prominent candidate, Barb Roberts, a black, is also a woman. If Mrs. Roberts gets one nomination, will the 2,400 state convention delegates in Grand Rapids this weekend be inclined to nominate Mrs. Pettipren, too?

IN HER FAVOR are her own political experience, her husband's clout and her credentials as an educator.

"Joan ran for the Wayne State board nomination two years ago and had 873 votes," Vince recalled during a lull at last Friday's district convention. "But she withdrew to avoid a deadlock with two other candidates. A lot of people committed to support her two years hence, which is now."

The reason Mrs. Pettipren is running for the State Board, rather than

the WSU board of governors, is that her husband has since taken a post as administrative assistant to WSU President George Gullen, and her being on the board could be interpreted as a conflict of interest.

As a three-term state representative (1965-70), Pettipren had a chance to build up a lot of political IOUs among educators, and his wife's candidacy is an opportunity to call them in.

A cocktail reception to help her race is scheduled for this evening in the clubhouse of Willow Creek Apartments, Newburgh two blocks south of Ford Road in Westland. Tickets are \$10 each.

"JOAN HAS been on the Eastern Michigan University faculty eight years, and before that taught in the Wayne-Westland district," said her husband. "She actually works with teachers as coordinator for student teaching in EMU's Wayne-Westland Center."

Born and raised in Detroit, Joan has some labor credentials: Her late father was a steward, and her mother is a UAW retiree. She earned her bachelor's degree at Eastern and her

master's at the University of Michigan, where she is a doctoral candidate.

Their oldest son is a senior at EMU, and the two youngest children (of five) are in the upper elementary grades.

As the children grew up, Joan found more time to get involved in Democratic politics and faculty organizations.

THE BIG question seems to be whether Michigan Democrats will want to run two women for the State Board of Education.

Her husband says certainly, emphatically: "1974 is the Year of the Woman. There's no reason we can't have two women candidates."

The eight-member state board has constitutional responsibility for coordinating state educational policy, from kindergarten through graduate school.

Pettipren points out that Wayne County, with one-third of the school population of the state, is low on state board representation. Among the eight are Mrs. Barbara DuMouchelle (R-Grosse Ile) and James O'Neil (R-Livonia). O'Neil's term expires this year.

Dem delegate hits 'bloc' thinking

The old Democratic Party habit of manipulating blocs of votes came under sharp attack last week from a Garden City precinct delegate who isn't a member of any major bloc.

The outburst came when 15th District Chairman Vincent Pettipren announced his nominations of three persons to attend a national party conference in Kansas City in December to rewrite the party charter.

Pettipren picked Ed Plawewski of Dearborn Heights to represent organized labor; Grace Hampton, of Inkster, to represent blacks and women; and Richard Marshall, mayor of Taylor, to represent municipalities. Harry Koss, manager of the Garden City secretary of state branch manager's office, was picked as an alternate.

The nominations are subject to confirmation by the Democratic state convention this weekend in Grand Rapids.

SHIRLEY GILMORE, of Garden City's 16th precinct, a Wallace supporter in 1972, asked for the floor and ripped into Pettipren.

"I'm a conservative. I'm not a teacher, I'm not a union member, and I can't help it that I'm not," she began. Mrs. Gilmore criticized the party leadership's preoccupation with blocs of votes and lack of attention to

conservatives and unaffiliated citizens.

"We've come home to the Democratic Party," she said, echoing a Wallace line, "and we want a little consideration."

During the three-hour convention in a UAW regional hall in Taylor, Mrs. Gilmore had run for several committee posts and was defeated each time until the last vote of the evening when she was picked as an alternate female member of the state convention rules committee.

PETTIPREN REPLIED that, being of French descent, he had never been the beneficiary of any bloc-type consideration in the Democratic Party, but was trying to make the most satisfactory nominations he could.

The charter conference, meeting last week in Kansas City, was reported by news wire services as on the verge of breaking up, with black and McGovernite liberals angry that labor leaders and party regulars were rejecting many of their reform proposals.

The modern Democratic Party was forged in the days of Franklin D. Roosevelt, who made a winning combination of labor, ethnic groups, intellectuals and small farmers. That coalition has been under great strain since the late '60s.

Election '74

Pair boosts 2nd District Dem morale

The "John and Eddie Show" is on the road.

As they promised, 2nd District Democratic congressional candidates John Reuther and Ed Pierce are campaigning in tandem against Republican incumbent Marvin Esch, and their supporters love it.

Dr. Pierce and Reuther made a brief appearance Friday at the Wayne 2nd District Democratic Convention in Livonia. They made it clear to applauding delegates they would campaign together until a recount of the indecisive primary vote makes plain who the winner of the 2nd District nomination.

"We are going to campaign jointly until we know the winner," Reuther said. "Then we will combine our organizations. We know the only way we can beat Esch is with a united party."

PIERCE PREDICTED that the recent resignation of President Nixon and the inauguration of President Ford are "going to make it very hard to beat Esch."

"In a matter of days after the new vice president is selected," he said, "you will see that person in Michigan campaigning for Marvin Esch."

Convention chairman Marvin Stempien joined in the praise for the show of solidarity and the call for the unity of the party as Pierce and Reuther left for the 2nd District Convention in Monroe County. "We must have a united party," he said, "and we can begin that united party tonight."

The convention itself did indeed seem to indicate an effort at unity at least in the Wayne 2nd District. The 46 precinct delegates present (73 were elected) passed resolutions and elected temporary delegates with a degree of unanimity which has not always characterized past Wayne 2nd conventions.

"The usual hassle that I've heard occurs at these conventions," said one of the first time delegates, "didn't occur this time. The older party members say it was one of the easier-going conventions. I think Reuther and Pierce had a lot to do with that."

WITHOUT SUBSTANTIAL changes, delegates passed three major resolutions including one in support of Caesar Chavez' United Farm Workers Union, a resolution supporting the rights of men in divorce proceedings, and another, unanimously adopted, opposing amnesty for former President Nixon.

Chairman Stempien also noted that a spirit of unity was very much in evidence at this year's convention. "You have to go to a convention sometime where there is a split in the delegation," he said, "There's none of that this year."

"I've been to meetings all over the state, and Democrats are all saying the same things. We are arguing only about how far and how fast to move—not about substantive issues."

Stempien noted that though the Wayne 2nd District Democrats are largely conservative, they have pledged support to the Democratic candidate, whoever he may be. "Pierce is very liberal for these people, but if Pierce wins the recount, they'll support him. They're tired of losing—they want to get out and win."

Besides Pierce and Reuther and a host of candidates for state offices present at the convention, State Democratic Chairman Morley Winograd, State Rep. John Markes (D-Westland), and Livonia City Councilman Jerry Raymond were in attendance.

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Fall Festival to offer smorgasbord of fun

PLYMOUTH—Thousands of visitors are expected to descend on this community in early September for four days of music, dancing, good-natured gluttony and gaiety during the annual Fall Festival.

The festival, which runs Sept. 5-8, has something for everyone, promoters say: Japanese Yaki Tori and German sausage; high volume rock and roll mixed with twangy bluegrass rhythms; antiques and streamlined modern sculpture, and even a "frisbee" throw.

The festival is a composite of the ef-

forts of some 42 service clubs from Plymouth and surrounding communities orchestrated into a four-day celebration. As a non-profit, non-commercial enterprise, the festival combines aspects of a fiesta with the elements of an old-fashioned country fair.

Nostalgia will play a part in the window displays in the city's shops, in the antique mart and the vintage car exhibit, and in the turn-of-the-century costumes worn by some of the city's men, women and children.

The 1974 Festival has its origins in a chicken barbecue sponsored by the Plymouth Rotary Club in 1956. The barbecue was held in one of the city's parks and drew a modest crowd of 150 persons, most of whom were Rotary members and their families.

In 1960, the chicken barbecue expanded into a Fall Festival and moved to larger quarters in Kellogg Park. Over the years, the festival has grown into one of the largest events of its kind in Michigan, drawing thousands annually.

This year's festival will be opened with a drawing from the Michigan State Lottery with prizes totaling an estimated \$380,000.

The lottery will be followed by a German dinner, the first of six mass festival dinners. If German cuisine doesn't suit the taste of every guest, there will also be a fish fry on Friday night, a pancake festival on Saturday, a roast beef dinner Saturday evening, and the dean of festival dinners, the Rotary Chicken Barbecue on Sunday.

Between meals, visitors can browse the antique mart at the Plymouth Cul-

tural Center or the arts and crafts show at Central School where local artisans will be on hand to display their works and demonstrate their crafts.

On Sunday, the products of Michigan's farms and gardens will be on display when the Rotary Club presents its annual produce exhibit and competition.

Also in store is a wide variety of entertainment, including the martial beat of the Plymouth Centennial Park Marching Band and the Fife and Drum Corps, the wailing sound of har-

monicas, and the precision harmony of a chorus. Dancers will move to the heavy strains of a German band and the commands of a square dance caller.

The festival is the result of year-long planning under the direction of a Fall Festival board which works hand-in-hand with community service organizations.

This year, festival board business manager Tony Flum is predicting "one of the best Fall Festivals ever."

City gets first new bank facility in half century

PLYMOUTH—The first new bank to be opened in the city of Plymouth in 50 years will open its doors this fall.

It will be the new First National Bank of Plymouth, a wholly owned subsidiary of Northern States Bancorporation and will operate under local management with a local board of directors.

Approval for the new bank was given this week by the Federal Reserve Board and it will be capitalized at \$1.5 million.

With Charles W. Heidt, formerly of the National Bank of Detroit, as president, the bank is expected to be ready for business in mid-September in the new building next to the Mayflower Meeting House on South Main Street.

These quarters, according to the future plans, will be only temporary as

an entirely new building is now in the planning stage and it will be erected in the block between the present stock exchange offices and Wing St.

With Heidt as president, J. Paul Perrot, formerly of the City National Bank in Detroit, will serve as vice president and cashier, while Robert E. Butler, also of the City National Bank staff will be the operations manager.

In making the announcement of the new bank, Benjamin H. Paddock III, president of Northern States, stated:

"The Plymouth community has been one of our major priority areas for expansion. It is experiencing strong growth, and we consider it one of the top areas in Michigan for future growth."

"Under local management, we believe the new bank will meet the rapidly expanding banking needs of the Plymouth community."

Northern States Bancorporation is the parent company of City National Bank of Detroit. Northern States also owns the Bank of Lansing, Grand Rapids Bank, First Citizens Bank in Troy, the Union National Bank and Trust Company of Marquette, First National Bank of Lake City, National Bank of Rochester, and Kelly Mortgage and Investment Company of Flint. The Grand Rapids Bank, like the new Plymouth facility, a de novo bank, was opened by Northern States in downtown Grand Rapids in April of this year.

The new bank, while meeting the needs of the downtown businessmen and the townspeople who have yearned for modern service ever since the National Bank of Detroit moved its main branch office to Sheldon Road, also will change the face of the downtown business district.

When the new facility is built, within the next year or so, it will be banked on either side with smart shops and a new motel area now in the process of construction.

With the new home for the retarded on the corner of South Main and Wing Street, the entire look of the area will be changed and the city of Plymouth no longer can be called what one judge referred to several years ago as a "sleepy little town."

Cycle fills dream of 68-year-old man

lieves he will use the car for that occasion.

Oldenburg admits that he really loves to ride the bike and that he rides it purely for pleasure "around town and out in the country." He has put 200 miles on his bike since buying it "second-hand from a fella in town" two months ago.

He says he's not considering buying

another motorcycle right now, but like most motorcycle enthusiasts, Oldenburg admits that he wouldn't mind having a bike that's a little more powerful.

"If I got rid of this one," he says, "I'd go a size larger."

About the whole idea of a 68-year-old man on a motorcycle, Oldenburg says, "you're as young as you feel."

We would like to point out to the Plymouth community that Norman Kee has told you half the story. He very conveniently failed to mention that the first year offer is tied to a two year contract. The second year offer does not compare with other districts that have settled for the school year 1975-76 and is totally unaccep-

table to the Plymouth Education Association.

This half-story is typical of the kind of information that the administration has fed to the public and to the board of education. We will reiterate once again that all we are asking for is a contract settlement which is equitable with surrounding districts.

Bowling alley hearing is set for Sept. 16

WESTLAND—The city council will hold a public hearing at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 16, on a proposed bowling alley opposed by Canton, Plymouth, Livonia and Westland residents.

The hearing, to be held in the city hall council chambers, will have the developer and foes of the proposed rezoning give their views on the controversial development.

Anthony Capaldi, owner of Westland Bowl, wants to build a 50-lane facility on the southeast corner of Joy and Hannan, across the street from Livonia and the townships of Canton and Plymouth.

The Westland Planning Commission last month unanimously rejected the rezoning request.

Opposing the rezoning were the Canton Township Board, the Detroit Catholic Archdiocese, and Canton residents in a nearby subdivision.

The archdiocese sold 17 acres to Capaldi and retained six acres for a new church to be built soon.

The church told the planning commission that Capaldi didn't disclose at the time of the land purchase what his plans were for the property.

Capaldi disagreed with the archdiocese on that point, saying that he did outline his bowling alley plans.

The planning department also recommended the rezoning be denied.

Prohibition divided Plymouth in the old days

Controversy in Plymouth over the sale of liquor was similar to that in many other small communities in the United States before and after Prohibition.

There is no record of when the first sale of liquor by the glass took place in the community. Accounts left by the homesteaders make no mention of saloons, but the use of "firewater" was certainly not confined to the Indians. A. B. Markham makes references to "the old jug" in his account of the festivities which accompanied cabin raisings.

By 1838, the village had three taverns, one or more of which undoubtedly sold hard liquor. From 1845 to 1848 the town voted against the sale of intoxicating liquors. By 1860, however, there were at least two saloon keepers in the village, as shown on the business directory of an 1860 map.

Opposition to the sale of intoxicants must have risen again prior to 1874. That was the year the local branch of the Women's Christian Temperance Union (WCTU) was formed at the home of Mrs. Mary Davis. The WCTU was most active just prior to Prohibition.

One long time resident recalls those early years, before the 18th Amendment was passed. "Farmers would come into town to get loaded. Their horses would take them home."

"AFTER PROHIBITION, people took to home brew, kummel, and cherry or dandelion wine."

Church leaders were in the vanguard of those who deplored the harmful effects of alcoholic beverages and who supported the WCTU, the Anti-saloon League and others who actively sought to prohibit their sale.

weapon was a hatchet. She wielded it vigorously in many a saloon throughout the country.

In Wichita, she used it to wreck the Hotel Carey and several other establishments, smashing mirrors, windows, bars, paneling, nude paintings and liquor stocks valued at thousands of dollars. Jailed many times, she paid her fines by lecturing and selling souvenir hatchet stick pins and brooches.

Mrs. Nation (her name was Carry, not Carrie), declared that saloon property "has no rights that anybody is bound to respect." Saloons across the



country returned the compliment by placing signs in their windows reading, "All nations welcome except Carry."

Among the Plymouth residents who attended each of Carry Nation's lectures in the Baptist Church was the late Karl Starkweather. Karl, who was

then 18, told me that he sat enthralled as Mrs. Nation attacked the liquor interests in a bitter and forceful presentation.

She autographed for him, at his request, a copy of her book, signing it, "Your loving home defender—Carry A Nation," placing no period after the A. (Her middle name was Amelia).

Karl remembered that the Wyman Bartlett's invited Mrs. Nation to sleep at their home after she refused to stay at the Hotel Victor. She had been told that it served liquor. "I

WOULDN'T sleep in a hell hole for love nor money."

When Mrs. Nation left town, after a short visit to the Starkweather home, young Karl carried her luggage to the railroad station.

From the platform she saw several men across the tracks, outside of Dan Smith's Cafe, smoking cigars. "Bull Durham," she snorted, "is an insult to every bull in the land. There's not a bull in the entire country that could be induced to take one sniff of the vile stuff."

Mrs. Nation may have been ahead

of her time in recognizing the damaging effects of nicotine. She was fighting a losing battle, however, in her effort to have the sale of liquor outlawed. Prohibition did come, nine years after she died, but it was of relatively short duration; passed in 1920, the 18th Amendment was repealed in 1933.

After repeal, the sale of liquor by the glass was immediately resumed in the township. Much to the chagrin of the wets in the City, however, the city fathers chose to keep the incorporated part of Plymouth dry.

TICKET for the election of 1887 reflects the interest in prohibition in the Plymouth area.

The Baptist Church on North Mill Street was the center of attraction in Plymouth on an autumn day in 1908. Carry Nation, the well-known temperance agitator, was scheduled to give three lectures on the evils of drink.

Mrs. Nation, whose first husband was an alcoholic, achieved international notoriety by the violent means she used to attain her ends. At age 61 she was still an imposing figure.

Almost six feet tall, she weighed 175 pounds and had powerful, muscular arms. Her trademark and favorite

In the waning hours of his annual summer holidays, The Stroller was standing along the rail at the very edge of the giant horseshoe as the water catapulted over the cliff at Niagara Falls. It was a sight to behold. Some nature lovers have claimed it is one of the seven most beautiful settings Mother Nature has given us.

For some reason, The Stroller just stood and stared at the white and silver streaks of water roaring over the cliff and couldn't help but feel that Mother Nature had a reason for providing such a tableau.

It had been high onto a half century since The Stroller had first gazed at the sight that has attracted countless millions of people from all sections of

Now, with a more mature approach, The Stroller couldn't help but believe that Mother Nature was trying to tell us something... trying to impart a message that could guide us in these

troubled times of unemployment, spiraling living costs and a world that is a bit uneasy because of political squabbles around the globe and the thousands of people who are almost lost in this fog of uncertainty.

As he stood there, drinking in the sight, The Stroller sort of sensed that Mother Nature was trying to tell us that no matter how great the fall everything would be all right in the end.

Could this have been Mother Nature's way of telling us that no matter how far we may fall everything will be all right at the end?

And to make the entire setting so amazing is the fact that man didn't have a hand in making it.

Over the years The Stroller has enjoyed his holidays in many places and has seen many things, but somehow, those settings he remembers best are those that Mother Nature provided without the help of mortal man.

For instance, he has sat for hours, on the southern rim of the Grand Canyon looking on in disbelief at the colorful rock formations. He has stood along the roads in Yosemite Valley and was awed by the beauty of it all. There have been times when he cast his eyes on the rockbound coast of Maine and marveled at this gift from Mother Nature.

Even over in Honolulu, where beauty abounds, it was on the plateau at the Poli Pas where The Stroller got the biggest thrill. And no man could possibly come close to duplicating the Pictured Rocks—right here in Michigan or the inspiring sight of the Canadian Rockies between Banff and Jasper national parks.

Sure, man has provided many sights, too. The Stroller always has a difficult time taking his eyes off the presidents' faces on Mt. Rushmore in the Black Hills and he marvels at the buildings that man is sending skyward and some of the modern things he has provided.

But to paraphrase the TV commercial, "You can't beat Mother Nature." The Stroller's trip to the Falls was just another bit of proof as he looked on the tableau that seemed to be saying, "No matter how far you fall, all will be right at the end."

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'History' course to embody analysis of futurist thought

The year 2000. How far can we project into the forces of technological and philosophical change? How will we adapt to this manifested environment? Will the next generation be disenchanted with the life the previous generation committed them to?

These are just a sample of questions a new "future studies" class at Schoolcraft Community College will seek to answer.

The class described in the catalog as History 260, is a study of the future by means of analysis of historical forces and technology in effective change and consequence in the U. S. and the world.

WILLIAM J. BURKE, a futurist and instructor of history at Schoolcraft explained the "future studies" class will take the line of an inverted history class.

He said in a regular history course you are dealing with past topics to understand where you are today.

"In a futuristic class, you identify major historical trends and the changes of those areas likely to affect our life-styles," Burke said.

Paraphrasing Harry Elmer Barnes, a philosopher and noted historian Burke said: "Unless a historian can give a better than average insight into where we are going, it is questionable

whether he can justify his craft."

Futurology in Burke's view represents interest in the future that man creates. Optimistic in his nature, Burke feels man can invent and create the future conditions that coming generations must live in.

"We are the product of yesterday's commitments and tomorrow we will be the product of today's commitments."

BUT THERE ARE also the pessimistic futurists who believe that the world is going downhill.

To them Burke answers: "If you defeat yourself, no one else has to do the job."

There are various levels in the study of futurology which is impossible to cover in a semester of class periods.

There are futurists interested in the so-called "gadgetry" of the 21st century, involving robots, and scientific technology.

And there are futurists interested in the role communication, medicine, transportation, and energy sources play in our changing life-styles.

"Philosophy is also a valuable area to study because as society changes it forces our philosophies to change."

In an attempt to adapt to the future, Burke feels an understanding of life-style changes is a priority in his "future studies" course.

"I am going to attempt the role of a coordinator getting students involved developing an expertise in various topics they can share with the class."

He emphasized a "futuristic learning environment" where a multitude of experiences are learned and shared.

"Futurology and the future studies class is geared to those people who are curious who want to learn from each other."

"The beauty of the class is the curiosity that is transmitted."

NOMINATED AS the Outstanding Educator of 1973 by Schoolcraft administrators, Burke hopes to implement a futurology curriculum at Schoolcraft.

Over 300 colleges and universities around the country have futuristic courses, which include environmental and ecology classes.

Burke hopes to see a program where technology and speculative (social and political) fiction is taught in conjunction with changing life-styles.

"If we prepare people to live in this

world, why not let people have learning experiences in the classroom as in the real world?"

Besides being a pioneer member of the World Futurists Society, Burke has planned a "Futures Week" to be held Oct. 7-11 on the Schoolcraft campus.

The purpose of the week is to raise public consciousness of present and future conditions and alternatives that face our society.

Noted futurists from the academic field will lecture on such topics as "The Future of Medicine," Technology and Western Man," and "Death and Dying in the Technological Age."

"We can learn from the past," Burke said, "but what is more important is when we do it — hopefully before the future arrives."

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Leary gets school curriculum post

PLYMOUTH—"We must strive hard to bring out the talents of the individual child because it is only a talent when we can share it with others. We have an obligation to help the child develop and share these talents through a good and coordinated curriculum."

This was only one of the goals proposed by Dr. James L. Leary as newly appointed assistant superintendent for instruction for the Plymouth Community School District. In his new position, Dr. Leary will be concerned with coordinating curriculum "vertically" within the school district as well as being concerned with curriculum on an individual building basis.

"I will be acting as an idea person, resource person and consultant, to serve the building as well as the administration and staff," Dr. Leary said.

Studying the Plymouth school system since his appointment, Dr. Leary said he felt that the procedures already utilized were very good and that he found the administration and staff very strongly committed to education. He added that he has found "strong evidence" of community participation by comparing it briefly to the others he has encountered.

"I'm trying to spend a lot of time right now listening to people and gathering up information so I can use my previous experience to help solve any problems. A good program is always

changing, ready to meet the needs of the community," Dr. Leary explained.

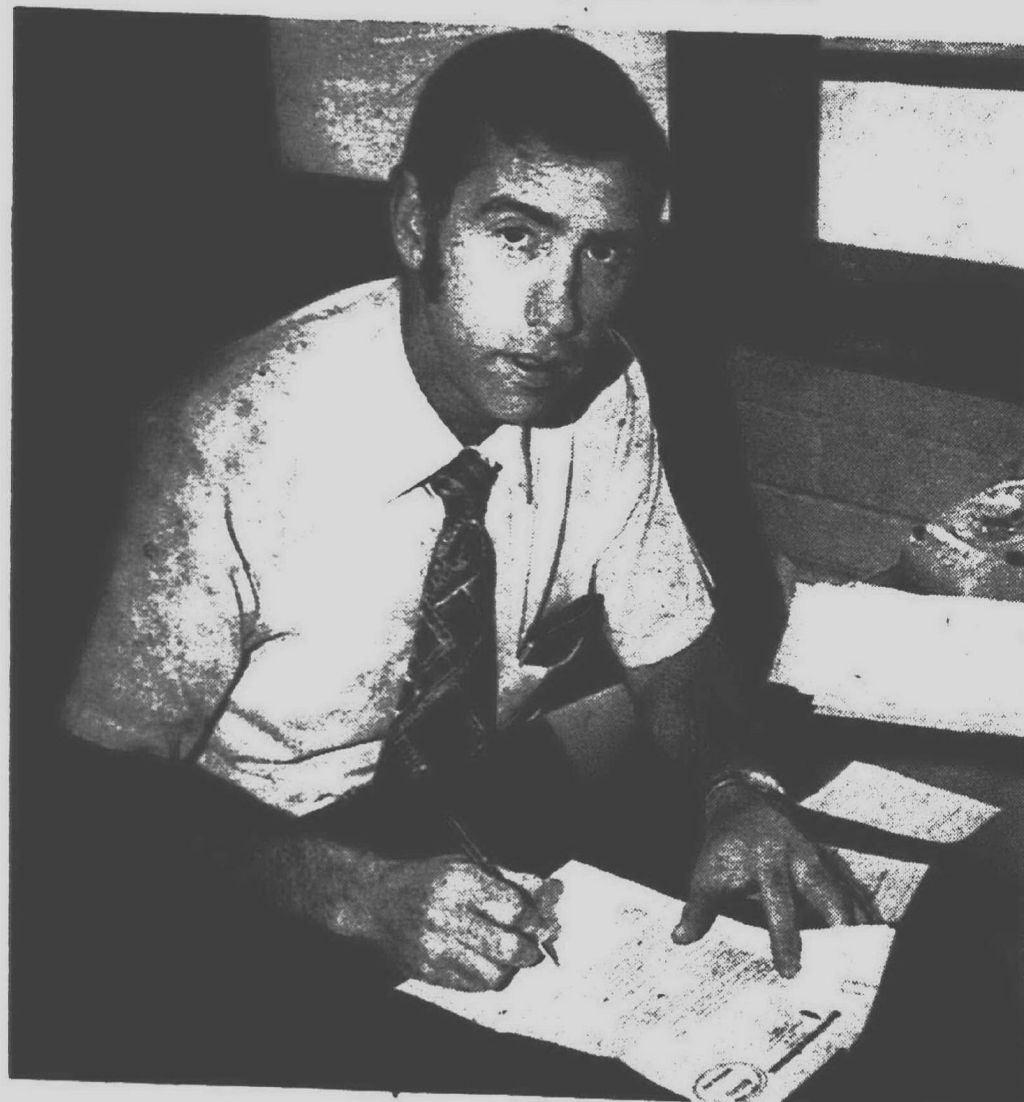
Dr. Leary's past educational experiences in the field of curriculum coordinator will prove an aid in his new position. He was with the Clarenceville School District for the past eight years. During that time his positions included teaching mathematics (9-12), director of adult education and curriculum and in 1966 he became the assistant superintendent for instruction and personnel.

Dr. Leary was also involved with the U.S. Department of Defense. In 1959, he took on the positions of math and curriculum coordinator for schools in Madrid, Spain. He said that it was at that time that he first became involved in curriculum as a means of working toward the development of a child.

Too often administrators lose touch with school age children. But Dr. Leary feels being married and the father of five children will help him keep in touch with the younger generation.

Asked if he would be doing anything in the area of helping Plymouth children with physical or mental impairments, Dr. Leary replied that he felt very strongly in favor of avoiding any labels for any child.

"If we are to live in a total society, we need to offer children equal education without discrimination because of what we call a handicap," said Dr. Leary. "When I was teaching I used to tell the kids that if there are 50 people in a room, well, that's 50 resource people because each one knows something that another doesn't and he can share it. Children with impairments are also resource people."

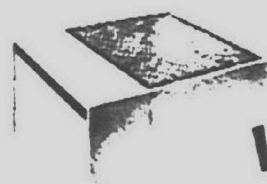

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Public hearings are slated for region transit package

The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) will announce tomorrow (Friday) dates for public hearings on its proposed 1990 Regional Transportation Plan.

The hearings will run through September and October in each of the seven counties of Southeast Michigan, with exception of the Washtenaw County hearing which is set for early 1975.

PURPOSE OF THE hearings is to provide residents and elected officials the chance to review a total highway-transit regional system developed by SEMCOG to meet future transportation needs of Southeast Michigan.

Persons will have a chance to ask questions and voice their views on the proposed plan. After the hearings, transcripts will be reviewed through the SEMCOG planning committee

process for possible plan modifications before it is sent to the general assembly next year for adoption.

Dates for the public hearings will be set at the executive committee meeting of SEMCOG Friday, Aug. 23.

IN OTHER BUSINESS Friday, the executive committee is expected to act on a staff proposal for a Regional Clearinghouse Review Committee (RC2) to provide more active involvement of member elected officials in regional decision-making.

As proposed, RC2 members would be appointed by the general assembly from that body, and must be an elected official.

Its purpose would be to review letters of intent or applications for grants from local communities to federal or state funding agencies—a service currently performed by SEMCOG

under state and federal regulations.

Under the present system, potentially controversial grant reviews are performed by ad hoc groupings of member elected officials. Local governments which submit grant applications or letters of intent are also made aware that SEMCOG has received a copy of their application for review.

Under RC2, however, SEMCOG delegates serving on RC2 would become aware of all federal or state requests for grant reviews as soon as they arrive at SEMCOG. RC2 Committee members can then determine if an application is routine or whether a special RC2 session should be called to make a determination on the application.

Michael M. Glusac, executive director of SEMCOG, says intent of the RC2 proposal is to increase involvement of local elected officials in SEMCOG's grant review process. "It will provide an open structure and access to local elected officials who will perform one of SEMCOG's more important functions."

SEMCOG records show that in most cases its grant reviews are "positive," with SEMCOG informing the grantor agency that the local project fits into Southeast Michigan's framework of regional planning and development.

THE EXECUTIVE committee is also expected Friday to:

Appoint SEMCOG representatives to the advisory committee of the State Office of Services to the Aging.

Approve the second reading of the proposed amendments to bylaws which, if passed, would alter sections regarding executive committee and school bloc representation;

Approve revisions to the 1974-75 work program and budget which include additional funds allocated towards SEMCOG's solid waste study, urban communications research and appraisal of a state airport systems plan.

The meeting will begin at 2 p.m. in Northland Inn, Southfield.

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Townships sue to retain patrol

Canton, Plymouth, Northville and four other townships have filed suit in circuit court to prevent the Wayne County Board of Commissioners from cutting off funds and thus ending the Sheriff's road patrol as of Aug. 31.

The board of commissioners has only budgeted enough money for the road patrol to operate at its current 28-man, three-car level through Aug. 31. At that point one car would serve the township areas.

Earlier this month the board's public safety and judiciary committee recommended that the county provide the additional \$98,000 needed to maintain the patrol through Nov. 30, the end of the fiscal year.

The ways and means committee, made up of the board of commissioners as a whole, will take up the question Monday and its decision is likely to reflect the interest of the board which will vote Aug. 29.

"Retention of the patrol is a vital necessity," said the townships in their

complaint. "Without the road patrol citizens will be without police protection, creating a crisis of enormous proportion."

The townships argued that their combined populations include 120,000 residents spread over more than 200 square miles. Their complaint calls for the board of commissioners and the sheriff to show cause why a temporary injunction maintaining the patrol should not be issued.

State law requires the sheriff to provide protection in unincorporated areas of the county, but the board's legal staff has issued an opinion that this service could be furnished by a single car.

While most of the townships have police forces of their own, Canton has none and relies completely on the county sheriff. Township voters turned down by 25 votes a public safety millage on the Aug. 6 ballot which would have provided funds to start a police force.

Plymouth group joins Muster at the Village

The music of the Revolutionary War era sets the mood for the Colonial Military Muster Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 23-24 at Greenfield Village, Dearborn.

The Plymouth Fife and Drum Corps of Plymouth and the Tippecanoe Ancient Fife and Drum Corps of West Lafayette, Ind., will highlight the muster activities.

More than a dozen military units representing British and Colonial troops will participate in the Muster.

Dressed in period costumes and equipped with authentic weapons they will reenact 18th century military drills and maneuvers.

On Saturday, the military units will set up field camps and prepare meals over open fires. Later in the day, the troops will assemble for battle practice.

On Sunday, Aug. 24, British and American units will demonstrate 18th century drill procedures. Between drills there will be musical performances, authentic fashions and uniforms of the period and a demonstration of loading and firing of a cannon.

The week end's finale will be a mock battle using 18th century military tactics.

Throughout the event visitors may see British and colonial military camp

sites and colonial craftsmen at work. The Three Fires Muzzle Loaders Club from metropolitan Detroit will recreate an Indian camp featuring everyday articles and trade goods used by Indian of the Revolutionary period.

Each day's Muster activities begins with a parade. On Saturday, the parade leaves the Village entrance at 11:30 a.m. On Sunday, it leaves the Village green at 12:30 p.m. Activities continue until about 4:30 p.m.

There is no additional charge for the Muster except regular admission price of \$2.50 for adults and \$1 for children six through 14. A special rate ticket which includes admission to both the Village and the Henry Ford Museum is \$4.50 for adults and \$1.80 for children six through 14. There is no charge for children under six.

Calligraphy slated in adult art classes

Calligraphy, the fine medieval art of lettering and illuminating, will be among the art classes open to the public during the fall term at Madonna College, Levan and Schoolcraft in Livonia.

It will be taught by Sister M. Angeline, professor of art at Madonna for 26 years. Lapidary (stone polishing) and painting will also be offered for non-credit.

Registration for these courses will be in the art department Friday, Sept. 6, from 1-3 and 7-8 p.m. All classes will begin the week of Sept. 9 and last 14 weeks.

Calligraphy will meet Wednesdays from 7-9 p.m. and lapidary classes on Thursdays from 7-9 p.m.

Students may register for one of four painting sections, scheduled for Monday or Tuesday evenings from 7-9 or Tuesdays or Thursdays from 10 a.m. to noon.

Each course has a fee of \$37 with an additional \$10 materials fee required for the lapidary course.

Cville board meets tonight

Clarenceville Board Of Education will hold a regular open board meeting tonight (Thursday) at 7:30 p.m. in the board of education building on Eight Mile.

The agenda includes discussion on a recommended substitute teacher pay increase.

David McDowell, superintendent of Clarenceville School District recommends that a \$1 pay increase be given to substitute teachers.

McDowell also recommends a salary increase for non-certified supervisors, such as the business manager,

and the administrative assistant, as well as a pay increase for administrators.

A report on the cost of damages which resulted from a break-in of Edgewood Elementary School last weekend will be given. McDowell said so far damages include two stolen tape recorders, cassettes and a destroyed door. The incident is under police investigation.

A final budget for the school year will not be proposed tonight. Public hearings on the budget will take place in September.

Livonia

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Esch criticizes slow passage of GI benefits

U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) has criticized the delay in passage of the GI education bill because of problems in the Congress and Senate, reaching a compromise in conference.

After months of disagreement, the House and Senate have finally come together on an acceptable veterans education bill, sending the conference report to both houses for what Esch hopes will be speedy action. Esch represents the 2nd District which includes Livonia and Plymouth.

AS REPORTED, the bill grants a 23 per cent increase in veterans GI benefits, from \$220 to \$270 per month for single veterans and from \$289 to \$366 per month for married veterans with additional funds for dependents.

The legislation also calls for an extension of time eligibility from 36 to 45 months, and initiates a low-interest loan program of up to \$1,000 per year.

"Inasmuch as the fall enrollments are only weeks away," says Esch, "I believe that passage of the bill is imperative and will urge the leadership to schedule action as soon as possible."

"While I am delighted over the report, I must admit that the problems encountered getting there leave me very much disturbed."

"Time and again the bill 'ping-ponged' its way from the House to the Senate and back to the House, with both sides refusing to budge on the issue of paying direct tuition payments to the colleges."

ESCH ADDED that bitterness and personal politics entered and often threatened to kill the bill entirely. "In the meantime, millions of dollars of benefits were being lost by veterans despite the two-year extension (from eight to 10 years) that passed just a month ago."

"Somehow, Congress and its committee chairmen have got to stop this warfare and come to speedier resolution of their differences. This bill, which is the largest increase granted since WWII, is a good compromise but has taken much too long to resolve."

"I hope that in the new spirit of co-operation in Washington," Esch concluded, "with the national interest as the paramount goal, that we will not see a repeat of the veterans' education fiasco."

Adult reading program offered

Classes will be offered at Madonna College in Livonia during the fall term for high school students or adults who wish to improve their reading speed, comprehension, or vocabulary.

Designed for those who want to improve skills before attempting college level work, the course will be individualized to each student's needs.

Total cost of the reading improvement class will be \$81, including all fees. Registration will be held daily from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until Sept. 3 in the registrar's office.

The class will be on Mondays for 15 weeks in two convenient sections. Daytime section will be from 10 a.m. to noon and the evening section from 7-9.

Pierce-Reuther join forces against Esch

The joint Democratic campaign of John Reuther and Dr. Ed Pierce for Congress in the 2nd District started this past weekend as the two candidates hit the trail together and met with both their campaign staffs in a Sunday morning planning session.

The two candidates, who are campaigning jointly against U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) until the results of a recount in their Democratic primary determine the winner, traveled and appeared together at Democratic county conventions in Wayne, Monroe and Washtenaw counties Friday night.

THEN SUNDAY morning, more than 40 members of the two staffs met to discuss details of the dual effort.

Afterward, Pierce and Reuther reiterated their solidarity in the campaign and took the occasion to criticize incumbent Esch.

"The more we talk about it the more determined we are that the incumbent Republican congressman must be defeated," they said.

"His refusal to take clear, open stands on the issues and his record of support for the Nixon administration increase our determination to work together so the eventual winner for this primary will have the solid support of all Democrats, independents, and dis-

gruntled Republicans in this district."

THE PAIR pointed to inflation and high food prices which affect all who live in the 2nd District, which includes Livonia and Plymouth, as key issues.

"The average family in this area needs \$1,000 more this year just to keep pace with the current rate of inflation and live the same as they did last year."

"This rate of inflation is going to continue until we elect a Congress which isn't dominated by the special interests," they continued in the joint statement.

"Esch has consistently voted with the special interests, for measures which have had the result of raising the prices on almost every item the average citizen buys."

For example, Esch was a chief supporter of the Nixon-Butz farm policy which paid corporate agribusiness \$4 billion not to grow food. This policy along with other Nixon administration bungs supported by Esch has cost the consumer \$25 billion over the last two years.

"Until we retire the representatives of both parties who are beholden to the special interests, and who risk inflation to fill the pockets of those interests, we aren't going to have a healthy economy and reasonable prices."

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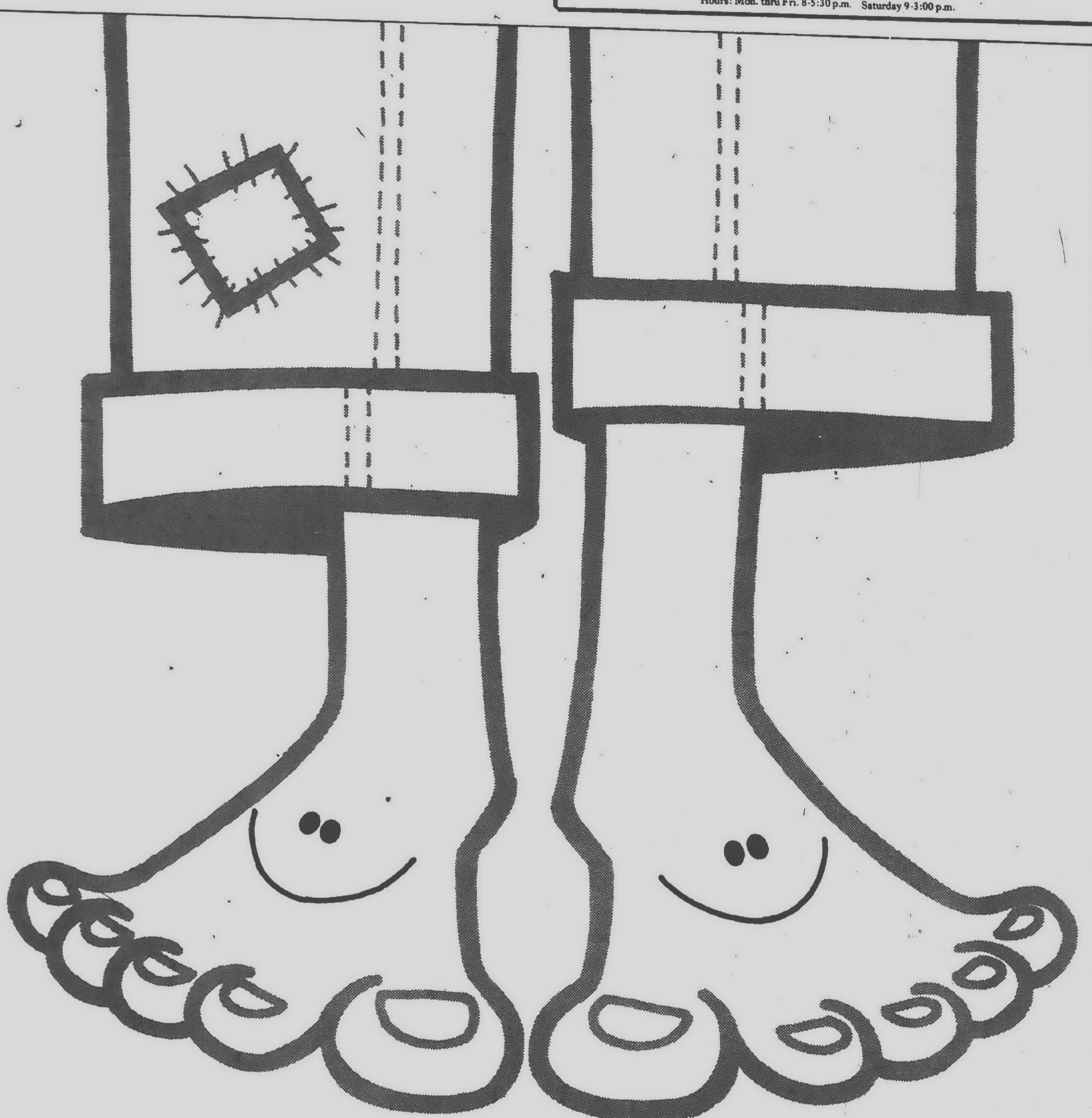


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Plymouth youngsters win top honors at annual 4-H fair

Jeff Slade won a special fun honor in the rooster crowing contest.



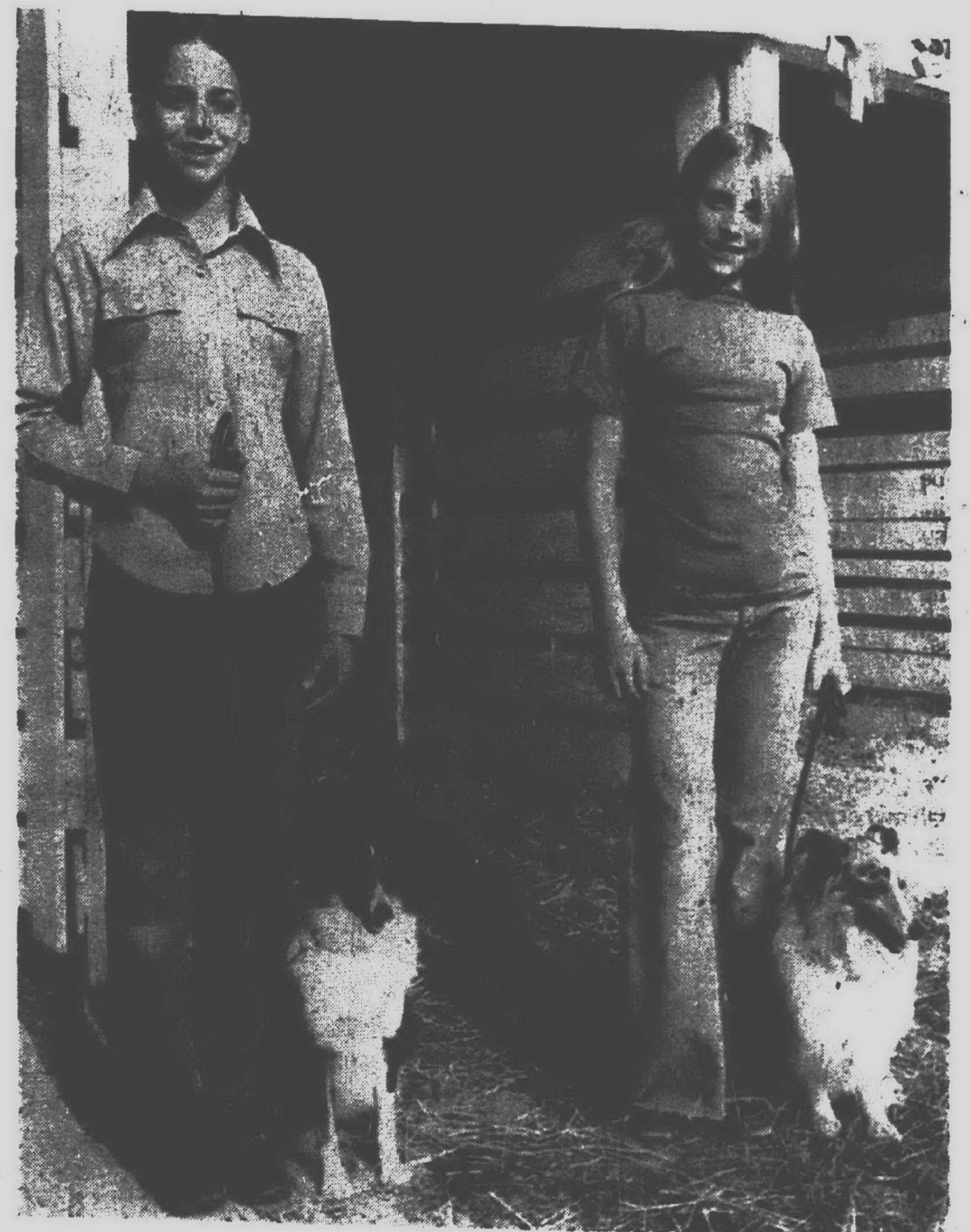

House plants are natives of distant lands

Home & Garden

Here are four popular plants suitable for growing indoors, along with some suggestions for the best growing conditions.

Rhoeo discolor, a native of the West Indies and Mexico, is a perennial evergreen usually grown in southern Florida. The stiff, waxy leaves - dark green on top and purple underneath - form a rosette.

Rhoeo discolor is sometimes called "three men in a boat" because the small white flowers are surrounded by two conspicuous bracts forming a boat-shaped surrounding for the blooms. The flowers remain open for a few hours each day over a long period of time.

Michigan State University horticulturists have outlined the following conditions for Rhoeo discolor as a houseplant in Michigan.

Soil for all these plants should consist of 1/3 perlite or vermiculite, 1/3 good garden soil and 1/3 peat or humus. This is usually the mixture found in packaged potting soils. Sterilize soil for all houseplants unless it has already been done in the processing of packaged soil.

Keep the soil evenly moist but not constantly wet.

Temperatures can range from 50 degrees at night and rise to 70 degrees during the day in the sun.

Because this plant prefers filtered sunlight, a place near an east window is best. There the plant will receive a little morning sun and adequate light for the rest of the day.

POLYSCIAS filicifolia, commonly called the fernleaf aralia, is a tropical shrub with bright green, fernlike leaves cut into narrow lobes. It grows wild in New Zealand, tropical Asia and the Pacific Islands.

As a houseplant, the fernleaf aralia will grow to a height of 20 feet. Because it rarely flowers outside its native habitat, it is used mostly for its foliage.

Keep the soil evenly moist but not constantly wet. Do not allow leaves to begin to wilt.

Temperatures in the home should be warm - 62 degrees at night and rising as high as 85 during the day in the sun.

The fernleaf aralia prefers bright light or full sun but will tolerate slightly less light. A place near a south window will provide ideal light conditions. Near an east window is second best.

SAXIFRAGA, commonly called the "strawberry begonia," is a hardy perennial spreading near the ground by

threadlike runners bearing young plantlets.

The leaves are soft, rounded, and slightly hairy. They are a deep olive green in color with silver-gray following the veins and spotted purple on the underside of the leaves.

Saxifraga is an extremely varied group of plants with a remarkably long flowering season. The white flowers are numerous and stand tall on erect panicles.

The Latin word, Saxifraga, is derived from saxum, a rock, and frangor, to break. The plant was supposed to break stones in the bladder.

Thoroughly drench the soil and allow it to become moderately dry between waterings - this allows air to enter the soil and promote healthy root structure in this type of plant.

Temperatures should be cool - as low as 40 degrees at night and up to about 60 during the day.

Saxifraga prefers full sun or at least bright light. A place near a south window is best with a place near an east window as second best.

FOUND IN Malaya, Borneo, New

Guinea and Sumatra, schismatoglottis is a herbaceous perennial plant belonging to the Arum family, Araceae.

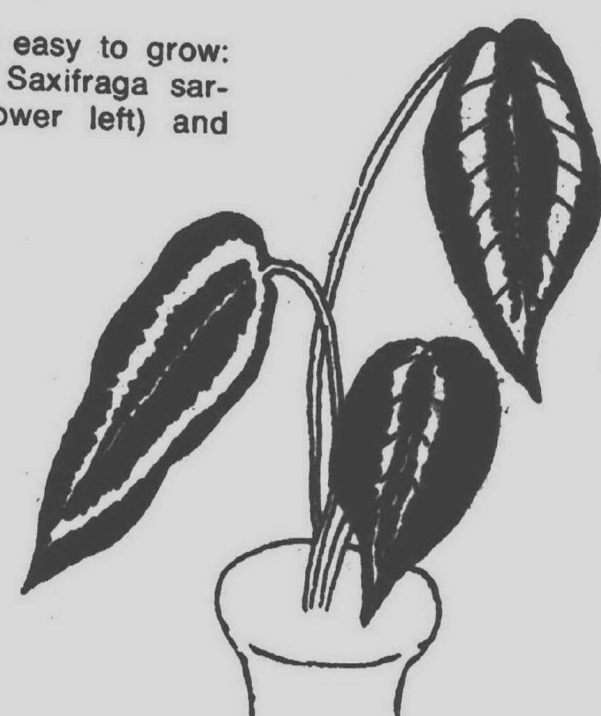
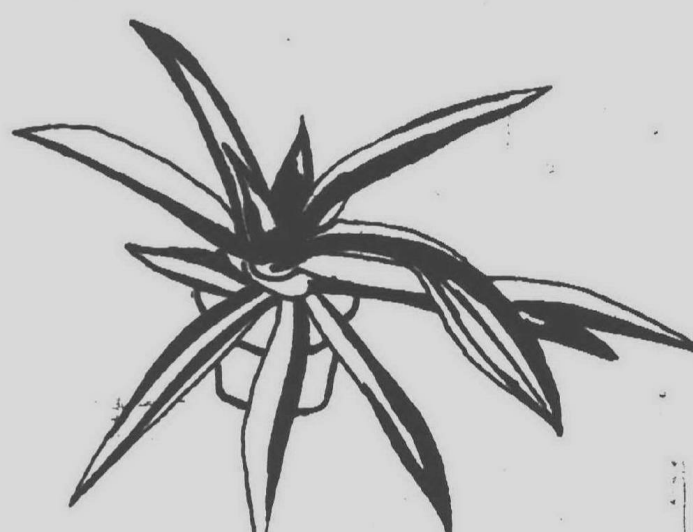
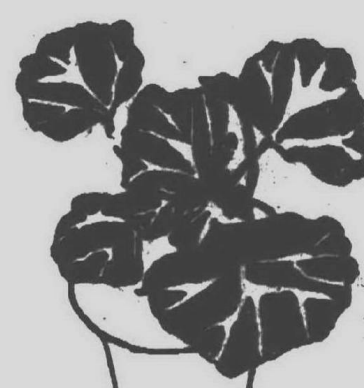
It is commonly called the "painted tongue" because its tongue-like leaves are split and banded with silvery gray, yellow or purple. The word, schismatoglottis, is derived from schismatos, meaning splitting and glottis, meaning tongue.

The leaves vary in length from 10 to 16 inches. They are papery, matte green in color with feathered, grayish bands down the middle. There are more than 70 different kinds of schismatoglottis.

Keep the soil evenly moist but not constantly wet.

Temperatures should be warm - 62 degrees at night, rising as high as 85 during the day in the sun.

A place near an east window is best for this type of plant. They prefer diffused light. Near an east window they will get a little morning sun and sufficient light for the rest of the day. If placed near a south window, be sure to protect it from the strong sun.

CLIMATOLOGY of Michigan precipitation will be discussed by Dr. Dale Linville, MSU agricultural engineer and Dr. Fred Nurnberger, meteorologist, Michigan Department of Agriculture weather service. Later in the program Dr. Nurnberger will discuss the need for weather modification legislation in Michigan.

Keynote speaker will be Dr. Thomas Malone, director, Holcomb Research Institute, Butler University. He will discuss worldwide weather modification, general history and decision making for weather modification at 1 p.m.

A noon chicken barbecue will be served for \$2.50.

Vegetable harvest looks promising

The recent home gardening boom may benefit roadside and pick-your-own operators, said Glen Antle, Michigan State University district extension marketing agent.

The outlook for fruits and vegetables at the roadside this year is better than last.

Although parts of the state are dry, consumers should be able to find most of their favorite fruits and vegetables.

From the standpoint of both buyer and seller, the fruit and vegetable harvest in southwestern Michigan is

promising—an abundant, good quality, short of being a bumper crop.

APPLES ARE a major roadside and U-pick item. Although overall production in the state is expected to increase seven per cent, there will be

fewer spies. Jonathan, delicious, and McIntosh are all expected to have better yields and quality, according to Antle.

Although the plum crop this year is small due to poor weather during pollination, consumers should be able to obtain adequate supplies at the fresh market.

Peaches are making a big comeback after two poor years. Due to a 50 per cent crop increase, consumers will be able to find peaches, reports Myron Kelsy, MSU agricultural economist.

Cantaloupe production in the state is up four per cent.

Vegetable acreage for the fresh market is up three per cent. Frost in mid-May slightly nipped the tomato crop, but an 11 per cent increase in acreage will overcome this problem, says Charles K. Woods, agricultural statistician, Michigan Crop Reporting Service.

WET WEATHER in May also slowed production of most onions, lettuce, celery and carrots, but they are faring well in the current dry weather. The crop should be as big as last year.

Production of snap beans is reported up 10 per cent; green peppers, 13 per cent; cauliflower, 36 per cent; and cabbage seven per cent.

Sweet corn harvest will vary with the drought conditions, according to Kelsy. The worst hit area is in southeastern Michigan, while the least affected tends to be in the Thumb area.

Excess water can do harm

Too much water will do more harm to your garden plants than too little water, according to Michigan State University horticulturists.

Wilting, chlorosis (yellowing) of the foliage, reduced vigor, death of foliage and death of shoots can result if too much water remains around the roots of the plants. Even plants that have been growing well will wilt suddenly when the roots are inundated

with water for more than a few hours.

Almost every case of excess water is caused by either poor drainage, excessive applications of water or too frequent applications of water.

To prevent overwatering, MSU specialists recommend that you water your garden only once a week during the summer so that the soil is moistened to a depth of six inches.

Plastic subs for cement in new building

LIVONIA - By the simple process of substituting plastic for cement in the manufacture of outdoor paneling for modern buildings, Architectural Research Inc., one of Livonia's newest industries, is making a terrific impact on the world market.

This new covering, officially known as Ar-Lite, is now being used in nine countries and many famous structures such as the new Harvard School of Public Health in Boston; the new Paris airport in France and the Desi-Lu studios in Hollywood.

Here at home, the popular new type paneling has been used at Bird School in Plymouth; the Austin-Lynch building in Livonia, the Kmart on Ann Ar-

bor Road in Plymouth Township; and some portions of Madonna College.

Seated in the office of his new building on Wayne Road, Richard Prusinski, who quit the Orchard Lake Seminary after 4½ years of study to enlist in the Army during World War II, confided that the success of this venture was one of the most exciting things in his colorful life.

"We started developing the product in 1957," he said, "and we now have manufacturing branches in Belgium, Holland and Australia and we're doing business with firms in Germany, South Africa, France and Luxembourg."

This new material is much lighter and therefore easier to handle than the old cement panels. Furthermore,

it has more tensile strength than cement, is impervious to water and serves as insulation when used in the interiors.

"What's more, it doesn't absorb dirt and always remains clean looking," Prusinski added.

The story of Architectural Research Inc. and its outstanding success reads like fiction.

It all started in Dearborn in 1957 when Prusinski was working with Mike Fermani, Artilio Tortolacci and Luigi Fermani on a wall surfacing job.

Figuring there must be some better way to do the job, Prusinski, who studied chemistry at the University of Detroit, conceived the idea of substi-

tuting plastic for cement in the panels.

Prusinski confided that the group figured it had something good - something that never had been tried before. But it was with caution that they moved.

One of the big breaks came when he wrote a letter to Sinclair Weeks, then Secretary of Commerce, offering himself as a delegate to the World Fair in Poland.

"Surprisingly, I was appointed," he said, "and this gave me a chance to introduce our material and give it a good tryout. It held up and when I returned we started to develop the product in a big way."

"Like all new businesses," he smiled, "we soon were in need of cap-

ital. We finally got what we needed from the Hammond family in Detroit. But, as we grew, we needed additional funds to carry on. We were told by the Hammonds that they had gone as far as they could. So we had to look elsewhere."

With a big, broad smile, he asked, "Who do you think owns one third of the company now?"

Before anyone could even guess he answered, "Mrs. Joan Payson, owner of the New York Mets baseball team."

Until it settled in Livonia in February the company has had several other homes. The first was at Telegraph and Warren Roads. From there it moved to Redford and now into the modern building in Livonia's industrial belt.

"We selected this site," Prusinski stated, "because it is ideally suited for our needs. And this industrial park

is one of the finest we have seen anywhere."

One of the features of the work being done on these modern panels is that it is all handwork. There is no automation with exception of mixing the plastic.

The plastic is poured into oblong frames about 90 feet long, then covered with fiber glass, and another coating of plastic before the tiny stones (like jewels) are placed by hand.

"And our 55 employees take a personal interest in the job, just as though they were making the panels for themselves," Prusinski said.

Aside from manufacturing panels for the covering of the building exteriors, the company also makes stained glass windows and murals for churches throughout the land, along with special jobs in some of the major buildings in the world.

Tennis causes catgut shortage

A chance visit to a booth in the recent national sports goods convention in Chicago has paved the way for a novel business in Livonia - importing sheep gut to string tennis rackets.

"We had no idea that we were about to embark on a business venture when my partner, Tom Loneragan, and I stopped at a booth being operated by a fellow from Spain who was selling this sheep gut," Ken Kelsey confided, "and before we knew it we were arranging to import the coveted sheep gut."

It so happened that the Spaniard sponsoring the booth was looking for new outlets, explaining the company he represented started doing business before the Spanish-American war.

At that time the company concentrated on selling its sheep gut to the guitar players and the few tennis players then around. Later the com-

pany switched to the manufacture of medical sutures until the tennis craze hit the country.

"Once we made this connection," Kelsey said, "it didn't take us long to form a partnership and we are now doing business at 16379 Levan as Kelsey-Loneragan Enterprises."

Because of the growing popularity of tennis there has come a shortage of cat gut and beef gut, with which the majority of racquets have been strung, and the tennis pros turned to nylon for stringing.

During this crisis the tennis pros learned sheep gut was more durable and the sheep or lamb gut was more resilient. This made control of the tennis ball much easier.

The new Livonia company imports the lamb gut from its new found friend in Barcelona, Spain, and this has proven to be a thrilling experience.

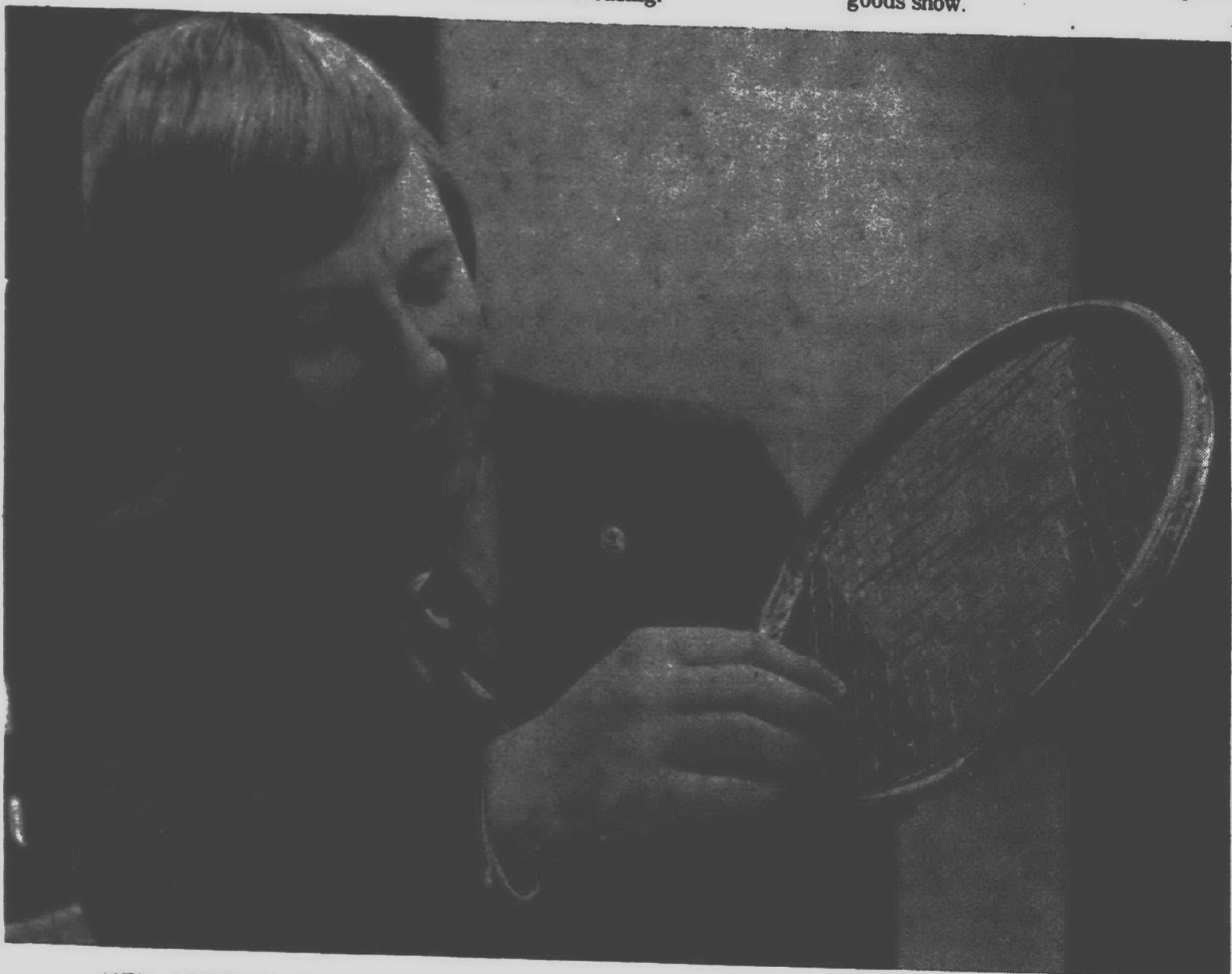
"We never had engaged in this import business," Kelsey explained, "and we were surprised to learn the procedure. We have to put up the money on this end to get credit through the bank in Spain, and then it has to be cleared again before the material can be sent - and it takes about four or five months to get here."

So great is the demand for these racquet strings that there is a backlog of 100,000 sets a month and the demand still is increasing.

It has been estimated there are more than 30 million tennis players in the country. The popularity of the game has hit Wayne County within the past year and has brought about the building of at least 10 tennis clubs in this area.

Many of these buildings have followed the pattern set by the bowling industry and boast air conditioning to attract year round play.

The tennis pros in the area have turned to the sheep gut stringing and Kelsey can't hold back a smile when he tells you that his company has exclusive rights to the Spanish strings and that it all came about because of a chance visit at a booth in a sports goods show.

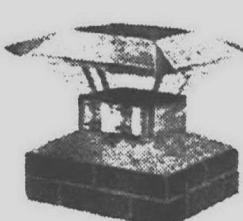

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor McLaren at 8:02 P.M. All members were present with the exception of Russell Ash who was on vacation.

READING, CORRECTING AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES - Regular Meeting, July 23, 1974. Mrs. Holmes moved that the minutes be approved as submitted. Supported by Mr. Burke and unanimously approved.

READING, CORRECTING AND APPROVAL OF BILLS - Mr. Burke moved that the bills be paid in the amount of \$65,164.15. Supported by Mr. Millington and unanimously approved.

COMMUNICATIONS - Bud Cline, Multi-Rise Associates. Re: Appearance to thank the Township Board for their cooperation. Mr. Cline, Executive Director for Multi-Rise Associates, appeared before the Board to apologize for the time expended by the Township people on their proposed project. He thanked the Board for the overwhelming cooperation they had received and for the courtesy extended by everyone connected with the Township in this endeavor. He explained the main reason Michigan State Housing Development Authority objected to the Site in question was the lack of a drug store within walking distance plus the noise from the interchange at Ann Arbor Road and I-275. The Board members pointed out that the site being considered in the City of Plymouth did not have access to a drug store and would be close to a Railroad Track, which would be as annoying as an interchange; in fact, it was obvious this was political move on the part of MSHDA. Mr. Cline said the site in the Township meets 99% of the requirements by the State, whereas the City site in question meets only approximately 20%. In fact, he said they had taken pictures of the shelves of patent medicines in K-Mart and Wrigleys showing the State what was available, and had offered to open a shop within the Building providing a pharmacy for the Senior Citizens, but to no avail. Mr. Millington said the City Commissioners want to provide housing for Senior Citizens, which was understandable but everyone agreed this is also what the Township wishes to provide. Mrs. Richardson suggested that the Supervisor write a letter to the Michigan Housing Development Association informing them of the Board's feeling in the matter. Mr. Cline said his suggestion would be that the Township get a copy of the criteria and/or Guidelines for Elderly Persons from the State and use the information from that as the criteria in comparing the sites in question before sending a letter to the State. Mr. Overholt moved that the previous action taken by the Township Board at the April 29, 1974 meeting to adopt the Tax Abatement Resolution No. 1174 for Plymouth Towers housing project (Item #36TIE-136T2(78-05-99-0016-000) and Ordinance No. XLIII be rescinded. Supported by Gerald Burke and carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS - Elizabeth Holmes, Treasurer. Re: Requesting Board to give consideration to recommendations from Auditor's Annual Report as to uncollected Rescue Runs. In a letter to the Board, Mrs. Holmes outlined two procedures which could be used to collect delinquent rescue runs, one in which the delinquents would go through the court and those not collected would be turned over to a collection agency, or the procedure she favored in which copies of the invoices would be turned over direct to the collection agency and they would try to collect and they would receive 50% of what they collect. The remainder would be written off annually. Gerald Burke moved that the delinquent invoices be kept on the Township records for one year, during which time the Treasurer would endeavor to collect and at the end of each fiscal year, the uncollected invoices from the previous fiscal year would be turned over to a collection agency for a three month period and a record of those not collected at that time would be sent to the Township Board for authorization for the auditor to write off. Supported by F. Millington and unanimously approved.

Breder-Hamill & Associates Inc. Re: Approval to award the Minehart Water Main Contract to Peter Basile and Sons (Awarded prior to H. Wilson & Co.) Mrs. Richardson moved that the Township of Plymouth approve awarding the Contract to Peter Basile and Sons to construct the Minehart Water Main contingent upon a release from H. Wilson Construction Co. of all its claims and contract rights arising out of the contracts, insurance policies and performing bonds and contingent upon a payment received from Maryland Casualty Company of \$12,749.20 to the Township of Plymouth. Supported by Gerald Burke and unanimously approved.

Breder Hamill & Associates Inc. Re: Report on studies made on the Seven Combination Sewers. In reply to Mr. McLaren's question as to whether the Township can in any way avoid the \$1875 fee, Mr. Breder said the only way to avoid paying said fee would be to not have the study made. Mrs. Holmes asked if there was any way a study could be made on sewers in different areas separately, possibly combining those on Northville Road or those in Robinson Subdivision, but Mr. Breder didn't think this would be a feasible approach. The costs by the County as indicated by the D.P.W. Superintendent at a prior meeting cannot be eliminated without complying with the new "Sewer Use Regulations," therefore the Township will be charged \$50 per month per regulator units, which will cost the Township approximately \$350 monthly for the seven locations indicated by the Board of Public Works of Wayne County and the Board of Wayne County Road Commissioners. Mr. Burke moved to authorize an expenditure of \$1875 for Studies to be made on the Seven Combination Sewers by Breder-Hamill & Associates, Inc., said report to be completed and to the Township Board prior to the October 8th, 1974 meeting. Supported by Mrs. Holmes and carried, with Mr. Overholt voting "No."

NEW BUSINESS - Helen Richardson, Clerk. Re: Recommending Township change the required time of keeping unidentified stray dogs from seven (7) days to four (4) days as covered in House Bill 5899. Mr. Millington moved that the Township change the required time of keeping unidentified stray dogs from 7 days to 4 days. Supported by Mrs. Holmes and carried unanimously.

C. L. Blake, Department of State Highways and Transportation. Re: Approval of contract for storm sewer construction across Highway M-14 in Plymouth Township, Wayne County. The following Resolution was offered by Elizabeth Holmes and supported by Gene Overholt:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Township of Plymouth Board of Trustees approves the Contract between the Township of Plymouth and the Michigan State Highway Commission and authorize the Supervisor and Clerk to sign the Contract on behalf of the Township for storm sewer construction across Highway M-14 in Plymouth Township. Mr. Overholt was surprised to see a recommendation at this meeting. It was his understanding each would choose three, and from those names, the three top choices would be back for an interview with the Board members. Mrs. Richardson said that Mr. McLaren had not been at the meeting when they interviewed the architects, and he had contacted them with the proposition that they return for another interview, but he was informed that this was considered a competitive move, and they would not come before the Board with a recommendation unless they have a contract. Eberle and Smith Associates, Inc. had been a name on each Board Member's list; therefore, that was the reason their firm was picked over the others. There was also mention made that Chief Gignac should present a list of needs and wants, which the Supervisor now has. Mr. Overholt felt that each member should give his No. 1 choice, and the recommendation from the Supervisor should be based on the most votes for that firm. A decision was made that each Board member would send to the Supervisor or Clerk before the Special August 28th Meeting one choice for an architect for the new Fire Station No. 2. 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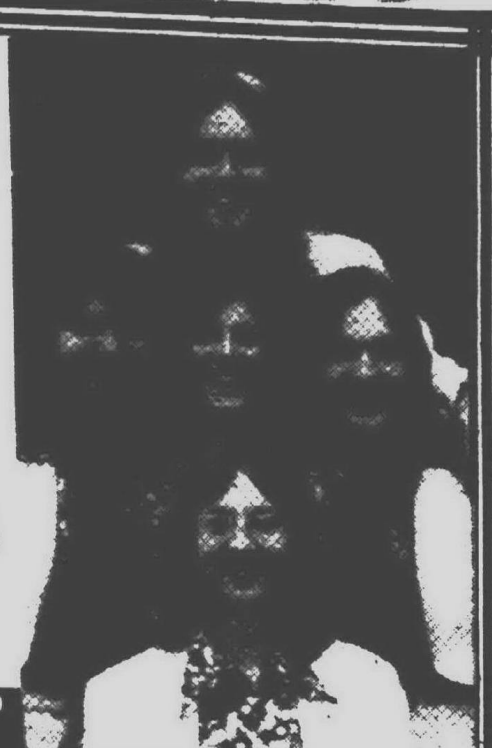

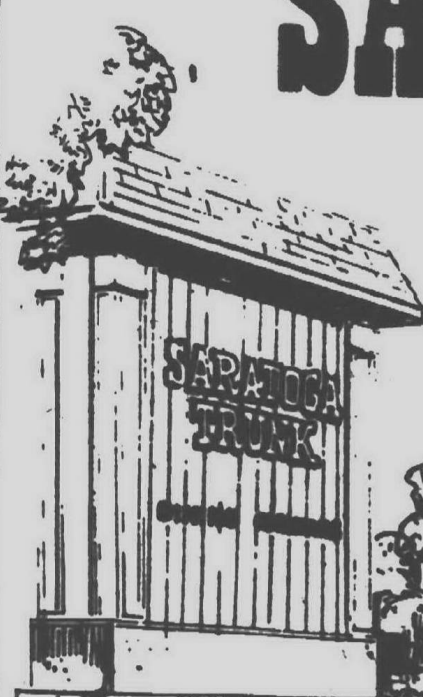
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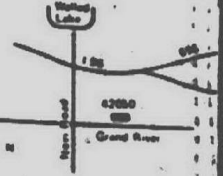
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Au Sable River adds to state's beauty

Michigan is a land of lakes and rivers, but few of the latter are as scenic as East Michigan's Au Sable River, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

"The Au Sable originates in northern Michigan, south of Gaylord, and empties into Lake Huron at Oscoda," Joseph Ratke, Auto Club touring manager, pointed out. "The river is famed as a trout stream, but is equally popular with sightseers and canoeists."

The areas along the Au Sable were once the scene of heavy logging, and traces of this era in Michigan history may be seen today along the river's high banks. Logs were rolled down the banks and floated down the river to Lake Huron where they were taken by schooners to the nation's cities.

A well-known attraction which draws thousands of visitors annually is the Lumberman's Memorial, about 12 miles west of Oscoda on a high bluff overlooking the river. The view of scenery from the bluffs ranks with some of Michigan's best.

Funds for the impressive memorial were furnished by 73 descendants of pioneer lumbermen. On a granite base are three large bronze figures—a river man, land locker and woodman. The surrounding area was once dense with timber and the memorial itself is near what was an old logging tote road.

The memorial is in the Huron National Forest and nearby is the Lum-

berman's Monument Store, convenient for campers in the area.

Two other memorial attractions are in the area. They are the Kiwanis monument erected by the Kiwanis Club of Michigan on a national forest cooperative plantation established in 1931 and a statue to the Kirtland's Warbler, one of the world's rare birds, placed in 1963 by citizens of Oscoda County.

A canoe trip down the Au Sable River is a pleasant way to spend a day or weekend on a family outing. It is a scenic sport, offering enjoyment for all. For those without canoes, liveries in Oscoda offer rentals.

The Au Sable is the scene of the annual 240-mile, non-stop World's Championship Au Sable River Marathon canoe race from Grayling to Oscoda.

Started in 1947, the race is billed as the "granddaddy of canoe races" with prize money amounting to nearly \$5,000. The event attracts the nation's top paddlers, who must portage over six dams before reaching their destination. Normally about 30 teams enter, but fewer than half finish the race.

Children and also adults will enjoy paddlewheel riverboat tours of the Au Sable west of Oscoda. The boats are the Au Sable Queens Numbers One and Two. The dock for River Queen Number One is at Five Channels Dam off M-65, while River Queen Number Two starts from Foote Dam near Os-

coda. The boats usually operate through mid-October and attract thousands of fall color enthusiasts.

Largo Springs, near Oscoda, is a natural flow of sparkling cold water emerging from the side of a hill. The spring is reached by descending a long flight of stairs to a quiet, shady ravine.

Mystery Ridge, on US-23 between East Tawas and Oscoda, is an entertainment-type presentation upon the law of gravity. The attraction is open daily through September and Saturdays during October.

No trip to the Tawas area would be complete without a visit to the U.S. Coast Guard Lighthouse on Tawas Point. Located just beyond Tawas Point State Park, only pedestrians are which run to the end of the point.

Ulysses Grant died in July

Ulysses S. Grant died in July of 1885, eight years after Rutherford B. Hayes succeeded him to the presidency.

Because of his major role in the Civil War, he was universally regarded as the savior of the Union. His terms as President, however, were not so successful and were marked by great public scandal. His administration is balanced by the passing of the 15th Amendment and fiscal reforms.

A Chippendale desk which once belonged to Grant is on display in the Henry Ford Museum, Dearborn.

Plane service began in July

The first transcontinental airplane service in the United States was inaugurated in July of 1927.

Boeing Air Transport Company built and flew 24 Model 40-B biplanes for this first regularly scheduled passenger and mail service across the country.

The planes featured an enclosed cabin for two passengers and the mail, and an open cockpit for the pilot. They had a cruising speed of 105 miles an hour and a top speed of 120.

One of the few survivors of that original airline fleet, is now on display in the Henry Ford Museum, Dearborn.

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The day Jerry Ford almost quit the team

Editor's Note:

President Gerald Ford, Probate Judge Willis Ward and Fred DeLano all were students at the University of Michigan in 1934. Ford and Ward were senior football stars at the time and DeLano, now managing editor of news operations for Observer & Eccentric Wayne County editions, was a sophomore sports writer on the Michigan Daily. It is that relationship which provides the background for the following column by DeLano.

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Memory of the one and only football game between the University of Michigan and Georgia Tech may have been in the recesses of President Gerald Ford's mind last week when he expanded on his belief in "basic decency and fairness" to say that he will be president of "black, brown, red and white Americans" alike.

I hope that somehow his thoughts and dedication were shaped by fate's timing that put him in close relationship with a black man named Willis Ward.

If ever there was a racially shameful moment in the University of Michigan's athletic history, it fell upon Oct. 20, 1934 when the university's athletic hierarchy acquiesced to Georgia Tech's demand that black man Ward—maybe the best end and halfback on the Michigan team—be kept out of the Maize and Blue lineup. At the time, Fielding H. (Hurry Up) Yost was athletic director, and Harry Kipke head coach of the Wolverines.

Ward, in turn, was the first black who had won a berth on Michigan's football varsity since the turn of the century. When the Yellow Jackets of Atlanta scheduled the engagement several years previously, there was no reason to suspect that such a black interloper would be on the field of play to soil their southern style at Ann Arbor.

If you want to pick out the one week when a senior U-M center from Grand Rapids saw for himself the humiliating effect of prejudice against the Negro, when as a decent man in his own right he bowed with others to the pattern of the times at the sacrifice of a black teammate, then this was the week that was.

Fred DeLano writes

(Judge Ward tells me: "The Georgia Tech game hurt Jerry. It hurt the whole team; it split the team spiritually. I understand indirectly that Jerry called his father to talk over whether he should quit the team because of it.")

Jerry Ford started and went most of the distance in every Michigan game that fall of '34 back in the days of 60-minute football. It brought him his third varsity "M" after being second stringer behind All-American center Chuck Bernard from Benton Harbor when the Wolverines won consecutive national championships with 8-0-0 and 7-0-1 records in '32 and '33. It's a shame to have to add that in '34 the Wolverines went 1-7.

His teammate all the way was classmate Ward, standing better than six feet and hailing from Detroit. Willis also was much more of the headline glamor guy, for instead of having his nose rubbed in the dirt of Ferry Field's practice turf as a middle lineman, he scored on end around plays and long passes, kicked conversions, and in track picked up three more letters as a sprinter, high jumper, broad jumper and hurdler.

Ward is one man who can say honestly, "I was there." the afternoon Ohio State's Jesse Owens broke three world track records and tied another in the 1935 Big Ten track meet at Ann Arbor, for Willis placed second to Owens in the broad jump and tied for first in the high jump in the same meet—won by Michigan, incidentally.

(Judge Ward: "Jerry Ford was the first one to make me feel welcome at Ann Arbor. We were close all the way from freshman orientation week together to our graduation together. From a colored-white standpoint, he is one of the finest, most decent sort of guys I know.")

The fact that Georgia Tech had asked officially that Michigan bench Ward for the one game

broke suddenly over the Michigan campus early that week after Michigan had lost its first two starts to Michigan State and Chicago. The Michigan Daily, student newspaper at the U-M, cried, "Exclusion of Willis Ward is Protested. . . Demand Cancellation of Georgia Tech Game if Ward is Benched." as it reported circulation of student and faculty petitions opposed to this flagrant discrimination.

But those were different times, and it all came to naught—except in men's minds. Who was to know that 40 years later Willis Ward would be a Wayne County probate judge, after serving previously as chairman of Michigan's Public Service Commission, or that one of his senior teammates would in 1974 be sworn in under historic circumstances as the 38th president of the United States?

(Judge Ward: "We have corresponded quite often through the years. Jerry is one of the few I would allow to call me 'Willie.' We have been 'Jerry and Willie' all the way through.")

As you can guess, Ward watched the Georgia Tech game from the press box. In Ford's own sense of fairness, it should be recalled here, too, that Tech's fair-minded coach, the late Bill Alexander, obviously at odds with his own administration, also kept Tech's outstanding end, E.H. Gibson, out of the contest.

To report that Michigan won, 9-2, for its only 1934 victory seems ludicrous in retrospect for

those of us who were part of the drama.

Our new president got little public attention that fall, as is the wont of 60-minute centers, but when the final game came along, Michigan Daily Sports Editor Art Carstens wrote, "Jerry Ford is described by the team physicians as 'having enough injuries to keep three men out' but will start at center."

When the season was all over, it was Ford who was picked by his teammates as the most valuable player of them all—sort of a forerunner. If I may be permitted—to the way Congress reacted to the possibility of Jerry Ford as vice president several months ago.

President Ford hardly draws huzzahs from the black press for his voting record on civil rights issues during his career in Congress. That "it leaves much to be desired" is about the best the current edition of the Michigan Chronicle, Michigan's foremost black weekly, can say about that record.

But the Chronicle also adds:

"Now that the buck stops at his desk, perhaps his judgment will achieve the statesmanlike quality in keeping with his newly gained position as the representative of all the people all of the time. . . He has the best wishes of a nation that hungers for a touch of honor in the nation's highest office."

(Judge Ward: "He's a conservative; he had to be to be elected to Congress for 25 years in that Grand Rapids district. His voting record makes it appear—APPEAR—as not decent to the colored man, but Jerry may be like Lyndon Johnson as a president who lets his basic decency come through. It will disappoint and surprise me if it doesn't come through. I'm optimistic. It's there in Jerry and I have great hopes as to his civil rights attitudes.")

Last week, as he addressed Congress and the nation for the first time as our president, Mr. Ford said, "We have a lot of work to do; let's get on with it."

I doubt that the line was original to his ascendancy to the presidency. I have a notion he used it on Ferry Field 40 years ago. . . where Willis Ward may have been the unrealized symbol of his day for "communication, conciliation, compromise and cooperation. . . and for 'reason and fairness' for the whole world.

'Growth' loses charm as an article of faith

For years, the basic assumption of the suburbs has been that growth is good.

Whether in more housing units or a new shopping center or a massive factory, the increased business or added tax revenue or increased local jobs that resulted from community growth were regarded as desirable.

Chambers of commerce were dedicated to the ideal of community growth. Many suburbs hired industrial development specialists to lure businesses into expanding in their community. Mayors had pictures of themselves taken at groundbreaking for new subdivisions.

BUT IN RECENT years, there has been a rush of evidence that our suburban love affair with growth is cooling.

The City of Ann Arbor has banned certain kinds of new construction for some months because the city's sewage plant is already over-capacity. Local authorities in suburban Loudoun County, Va., have refused to approve a 4,200-unit new town, even though the developer promised the county to install necessary public services.

Earlier this year, the City of St. Petersburg passed (unconstitutionally) an ordinance requiring the last 25,000 people who moved in to move out, as an attempt to remedy the local feeling that the city had become too big.

And in 1972, voters in Boca Raton, Fla., voted to adopt a zoning plan with a limit of 40,000 residential units.

THE CRY AGAINST growth has been more muted in these suburbs, but it is beginning to be heard.

Talk to the city fathers in Plymouth or Rochester, and they'll tell you that in the growth their communities have experienced in recent years, much—perhaps too much—has been lost.

Franklin for years has pushed the ideal of "the town that time forgot," and even in Livonia some farsighted officials are beginning to wonder

about the balance between industrial/residential growth and green space.

THE REASONS the suburbs may come to reject growth are varied, but they come down to three main arguments:

- Growth requires massive, expensive, tax-financed public investments in sewage plants and streets and incinerators and so forth.
- Growth reduces the amount of green space and countryside to unacceptably low levels.
- Growth destroys the tissue of things that go into giving a community a certain character and a particular intimacy that make it a nice place to live in.

TO DATE, these reasons have not become strong enough emotionally or politically to overturn the notion strongly embedded in the law that a man who owns land can largely develop it when and as he sees fit. Zoning ordinances to some degree limit the rights of the private property owner, but even these are predicated on the assumption that growth is good and merely needs to be properly directed and controlled.

The costs of growth, however, are beginning to mount. Taxes continue to go up; communities continue to lose character; urban sprawl continues to hack at the quality of life.

In the long run, we'll have to overturn the "growth is good" assumption, and when we do we'll find a lot of new problems but even more new opportunities for a better life.

'You're fired!'

A too-nice PR guy gets the ax from Pistons

I'm not a sports writer nor do I pretend to understand the intricacies of the games.

But I do know something about winners and losers, and I recognize a foul ball when I see one. And I know even more about George Maskin, for-

mer publicity director for the Detroit Pistons basketball team.

George is a super guy who feels like a loser these days. After 14 years of fronting for a losing team in order to sell it to a disenchanted public, George got the old ax job in two short words: "You're fired!"

IF YOU'VE EVER been through a merger or acquisition, you know the apprehensions of wondering how and if you'll fit into the new organization. Some survive; others are eased out gracefully and replaced. Still others leave because they can't weather the change.

But to wipe out 14 years of dedication with two harsh words is a foul in anybody's ball park.

We've known George for 28 years, ever since he crashed our wedding wearing an umpire's suit. He stood out like a pair of brown shoes in a world of tuxedos.

George came to the wedding to see Elaine, my best friend and bridesmaid, who later became his wife. In those days, George was writing sports for the old Detroit Times and umpiring a bit in the sandlot circuits on the side.

ONE BLEAK night, George and the rest of the Times staff got a telegram announcing that the paper had folded. The Maskins had a young family by then. Their security was shaken.

A job is a job after all, and you can strike out at the drop of a Western Union message.

Guys like George aren't cut out for the competitive jungle of the business world. Writers—even some public relations men—are traditionally sensitive, creative and idealistic. Sometimes they have accident-prone egos.

George has a tough shell, a soft heart, and an iron-clad sense of fair play and integrity. He's a task master at his job, and he stands 10 feet taller than anyone in the Detroit sports circle.

He's too sincere to be a PR bull shooter, and his brusqueness covers up a basic shyness. But whatever he did, he persevered for 14 years while the Pistons turned over coach after coach, player after player.

THE PISTONS finally made the playoffs last winter. But now the team has lost a loyal champion who never missed a game or took a vacation or bad-mouthed the team when it was down.

George is a winner in anyone's lineup. He sure doesn't deserve to be counted out.

Save money, dump the draft

Everybody knows that the draft expired two years ago and the United States has been establishing an all-volunteer army.

I am sure most Americans believe that when the draft law expired in June of 1972, the Selective Service system was dismantled, the federal government was able to reduce expenses, and young men no longer had to be concerned about being inducted into the armed services unless they volunteered.

The truth is that, although the draft law has expired, the Selective Service system is still with us. Young men still must register for the draft

within 30 days of their 18th birthday or face going to jail as draft evaders.

IN FACT, last year, 3,495 persons were tried for failure to register within 30 days of their 18th birthday, 977 were convicted, and 260 were sentenced to jail for an average of 17.5 months.

Another 657 have been inducted for failure to register in the first six months of 1974.

An interesting part of the draft law is that, if a young man voluntarily appears at a draft board to register more than 30 days after his 18th birthday, he is treated as an "evader" and has his

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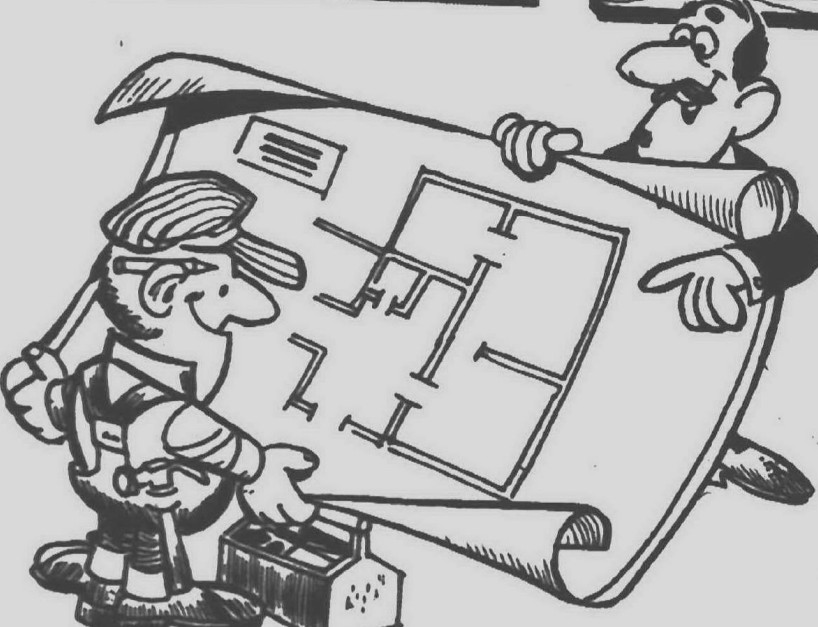
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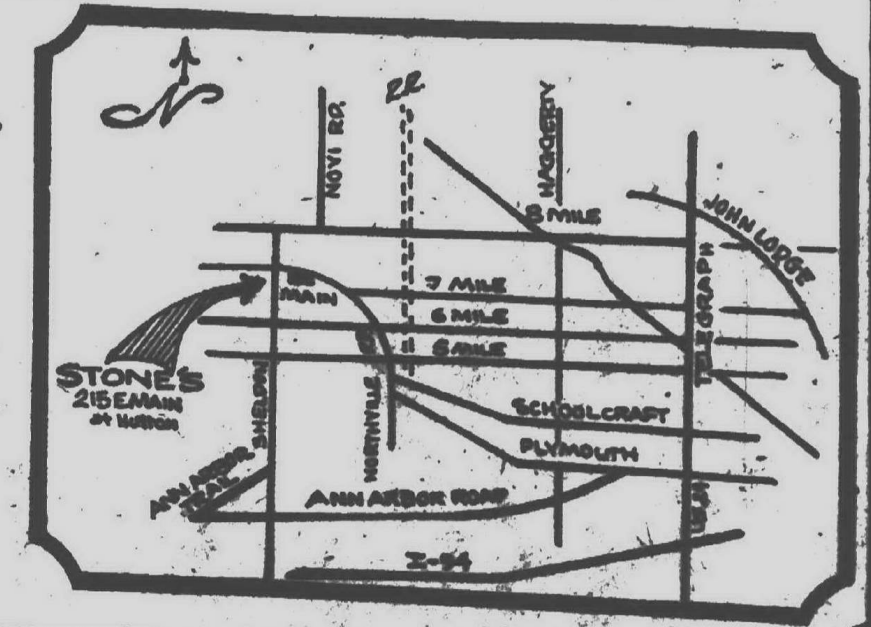
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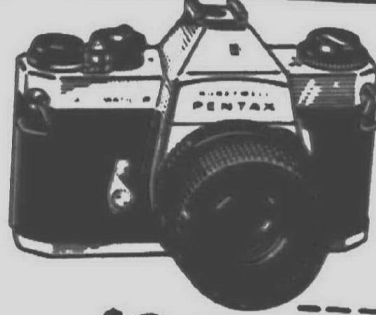
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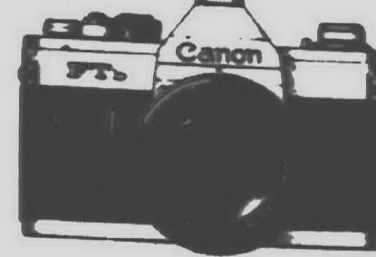
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A lady cop's place -- is it in the patrol car?

"By Federal law and guidelines, every police department must hire women and assign them on an equal basis to patrol or must demonstrate that there is a legitimate occupational qualification for not doing so," Patrick V. Murphy, president, U.S. Police Foundation.

The words are from a former Detroit police chief, and he's talking about something brand new in law enforcement—policemen and policewomen working side by side and on an equal basis. In the patrol car, on the arrest, during a raid.

Following federal court rulings, the controversial approach has been tried and studied officially in Washington D.C. It has been put into practice, too, in other cities, including Detroit and Ann Arbor.

Will it soon become part of our suburban scene?

Probably, eventually, says Westland Police Chief William Rechlin.

Hopefully never, insist his counterparts in Livonia, Plymouth, Redford Township and Garden City.

IT WORKS in Washington, says Murphy, contending that the evidence shows "no significant reason exists" for differentiating between policemen and women.

But locally there are different reactions.

"I can't see that we have any alternative to giving a woman equal treatment, providing she can perform on the job," says Rechlin, who recently added a female cadet to Westland's police force.

"The studies are misleading," in the opinion of Plymouth Police Chief Tim Ford. "The statistics compiled don't bear out the conclusion."

"I can't bring myself to see women in squad cars," says Redford Township Chief Edwin Gleza.

"I don't interpret the federal rulings as meaning duty in patrol cars," is the word from Livonia Chief Robert Turner. "If forced legally in this matter, I would put a woman in the car and she would operate just like Charlie. I think she would fail."

And from Chief Robert Behrendt of Garden City:

"When you have the case of an unruly drunk, it takes a doggone good man to handle him, let alone a little woman."

THE FOUR-TO-ONE reaction against using women in the patrol car has many reasons in the minds of the men who administer law enforcement in this area.

If some male chauvinism is involved, male chivalry comes through more strongly.

Mentioned too are social problems, a concern for giving the best protection possible for the taxpayer dollar and worry that the public would be unprepared for such a move even if the police departments could pull it off.

ALL FIVE POLICE CHIEFS voiced the highest respect for the women who do police work.

There are four in this area—Margaret Setzer and Anne Dempsey in Livonia, Vi Mote in Redford Township, Laura Moore in Westland.

They handle investigative work in cases involving women and juveniles of both sexes. They also work with the schools, and as often as possible they are the ones who do the questioning in sexual assault cases.

"Our two women are invaluable," said Livonia's Chief Turner.

"I can see where the role of the policewoman may well be expanded," added Redford's Gleza. "More research, more investigative work."

IN WESTLAND it will be expanded, said Chief Rechlin. "Officer Moore functions as a policewoman should when you have one," he adds. "But the orders are to increase the number of women on the force, and you can't have a larger percentage of the force handling just juvenile and sex offenses. If our new cadet works out, she'll be on shift work like other officers."

Plymouth and Garden City forces are all male. If a woman were the best-qualified applicant, Plymouth's Ford said he would hire her, but so far that hasn't happened. Behrendt of Garden City said the possibility of adding a policewoman was considered when the last vacancy was filled, but it was decided then a man could be more versatile.

Behrendt does, however, think highly of women police officers. His wife worked for years as a police matron in Detroit, and his daughter, Mrs. Barbara Vorbeck, formerly served on the Livonia force. He proudly quotes Bob Turner as saying "She was a real cop."

BUT IT'S SOMETHING else, the chiefs declare, to put a woman in a squad car as it goes about the day-to-day, always potentially dangerous business of keeping law and order.

Safety for all concerned and the traditional attitude toward women come together as the five men considered women in this position.

Livonia's Turner put it this way:

"There is an instinctive reaction that a well-trained police officer makes in a given situation—a quick action that goes with the intuitive

knowledge that something is wrong.

"I just am not convinced that a woman would react and move that way. The male officer then would be at a disadvantage, physically, even though his female partner's mental processes might be quicker."

Behrendt told about a recent police call in which two Garden City officers had to disarm a man who had gone berserk and was flailing a baseball bat.

"They subdued him," he said, "but one of my men got the bat across his back. He was out two days. Think how much greater the injury might have been to a woman."

IN PLYMOUTH Chief Ford talked about the role of the policewoman on the spot in a violent situation and the argument that her very presence may have some calming influence.

"The blinder that keeps getting in the way," he said, "is that in our society there still is a reverence for women."

"While that pedestal exists, she is not in danger. Now she is a novelty; she comes on the scene and the drunk sobers up. But five years from now, how do we know what the situation will be?"

Redford's Gleza continues the theme. "There is so much violence out there," he says, "there is such a lack of respect for the law. How can putting a woman in a patrol car increase that respect?"

"In Redford, where we have one-man patrol cars, I would worry about too much concern being spent on the woman in the next car. And about how the public would react to a woman being sent on prowler calls."

AND ONE MORE MATTER could not be overlooked as the chiefs considered male and female officers sharing a squad car.

"No one but police officers," said Ford, "can really understand the husband-wife relationship that two patrol car officers have. It's the way it happens in performance of duty."

"So if one is a woman—well, police officers have the biggest divorce rate of any discipline, and they don't need more stressful situations."

"WESTLAND CHIEF RECHLIN concedes he has had a few comments from police wives on that matter, but insists such a situation is at least a couple of years off and he plans to handle it as seems necessary when the time comes."

"The reason I've taken this approach," he said, "is that the ruling has been made that we must not discriminate. We will follow it."

"I can see problems, of course. But every time we change we have problems. Then we make adjustments."

These policewomen don't want patrol car duty

Two experienced policewomen, Vi Mote in Redford Township and Margaret Setzer in Livonia, definitely aren't pushing for treatment equal to that accorded men on their respective forces.

"Absolutely not—it would be a disaster," said Sgt. Mote when asked if women should take their turn on patrol car duty.

"No way would I want to do it," said Mrs. Setzer. "My work is interesting and I've been satisfied."

She did add, however, that she had read of policewomen being assigned differently in a Florida city and that apparently the move had worked out well.

"Eventually, I think it may come," Mrs. Setzer stated. "There are many women interested in police work, and if they can handle that kind of assignment I think it should be up to them."

ONE SUCH WOMAN is 22-year-old Suzanne Rochford, who recently

began training as a cadet on the Westland police force.

Miss Rochford qualified by placing second on an eligibility list of nine candidates and was one of four sworn in. Both she and Westland Police Chief William Rechlin expect her treatment, training and advancement will be on a basis equal to that of the three male cadets sworn in with her.

"I think police officers are supposed to help people and I will do the best I can," she said. "I don't look on myself as a pioneer."

THE POLICEWOMEN now on the job find the cases they now handle fill their days and give plenty of opportunities for helping.

Mrs. Setzer, a registered nurse who worked as a Detroit policewoman several years before joining the Livonia force in 1967, said a lot of her work, especially with young offenders, is in the nature of preventing serious crime.

In her day's work are neglect and abuse cases, shoplifting and drug of-

fenses and, of course, investigating sex crimes in which her boss, Livonia Chief Robert Turner, has said "policewomen can do a much better job of getting the information we absolutely must have to get a conviction."

SGT. MOTE, A POLICEWOMAN for more than 22 years now, wants to see two more women added to the Redford Township force, because she'll be retiring in another 2½ years and because there's enough work for two in the case categories she handles.

But trying to put women on regular patrol beats, she thinks, "would lose the efficiency of male officers and waste the potential of the female ones."

And she sees an explosive situation in coupling male and female officers in a patrol car.

"Two people in a patrol car for eight hours at night can only spell trouble," she said, "and you don't have to have your mind in the gutter to see that."

MRS. CARMEN HALE will make homemade donuts. Last year she used 25 pounds of flour, and expects to equal that amount this year.

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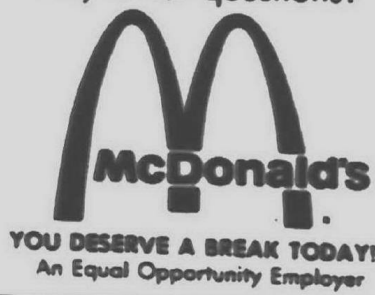

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U.S. films liberate men, not women, prof charges

Women's liberation hasn't arrived in the American film industry. The only ones getting liberated in American films are the men who are cast as guilt-free and alienated antiheroes living in a rotten world where all the problems are somebody else's fault.

The assessment of male and female stereotypes in American films was made by Jenifer Banks, Michigan State University assistant professor of

American Thought and Language. She presented her views at a recent Popular Culture Association conference in Milwaukee.

"The film industry," Ms. Banks said, "refuses to explore women's problems beyond those of love and domestic security, or to acknowledge that they too may be dissatisfied with life beyond their front door."

Women in films are not allowed any

sense of dread, anxiety or anguish beyond that associated with the heart and the home. All that is allocated to the men, she added.

MS. BANKS, a longtime movie buff, began watching films in her native Great Britain and has been following American films regularly since 1967 when she came to the United States.

Her own stance on women's liberation is a conviction that the movement is trying to emphasize the dignity of women, while the American male-dominated society still tries to avoid the issue by mocking the movement with irrelevant questions about who opens the door for whom, who lights whose cigaret, who initiates telephone calls, or by concentrating on the early bra-burners.

"The film industry reinforces this male attitude," she said, "by refusing to show women characters who are making meaningful contributions beyond the home or who are trying to gain recognition of themselves as individuals."

"Through a far from subtle propaganda based on such omission, the industry perpetuates the conservative and oppressive attitudes still held by many, both men and women."

ON THE AMERICAN screen, she explained, women find happiness in devoting their lives to serving and helping their male partners, or they fail to secure "such happy bondage."

"Marriage and domesticity, then, are the only hope of salvation the screen offers a woman. We must take it on faith that domesticity and diapers afford complete satisfaction," she said.

Outlaws and overt criminals are the attractive male protagonists in "Paper Moon," "The Sting," "The Candidate," and other films.

"Faced with the dilemma of a rotten world," Banks added, "they match violence with violence, corruption with corruption, bolstered by their beliefs that their actions are in self defense. We are carried along with the debonair swaggering until we are blinded by the amorality and cruelty of these charming crooks."

HOLLYWOOD'S favorite woman is virtuous, patient, wholesome, alert, confident, and enjoys men, Banks said.

Occasional films like "Sunday, Bloody Sunday," and "Rachel, Rachel," present sympathetic pictures of the dilemma of the brave modern woman but usually in the end such women come off as eccentric or destructive types facing empty futures.

"Rather than help the unhappy wife and mother to escape her problem," she said, "films project her as a problem to be escaped."

Banks concluded that the stereotype images of modern men and women as victims of their social environment are reactionary, confirm the results of past mistakes, and offer no useful explanations or positive alternatives to the exploitation of women.

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Patients hear piped-in sermons

Tallulah Ray now lives at the West Trail Nursing Home in Plymouth. But as a young woman she lived on a farm in Jackson County, Ala., where she faithfully went to church every Sunday driving her family and friends in a wagon pulled by two mules.

Old habits are hard to break and today, while Mrs. Ray is unable to move about much, she still can listen to her Sunday sermon through the miracle of electronics.

Every Sunday, sermons by the Rev. E. Edwin McDonald, pastor of the

Plymouth Church of the Nazarene, are piped through a loudspeaker to 10 or 12 senior citizens sitting in the nursing home lobby.

Because a microphone is also placed near the choir, those in the lobby can also hear the church choir sing the old familiar hymns.

Often prior to the sermon, a man from the congregation, Kenneth McMullen, will go to the nursing home and conduct a Bible study class and distribute bulletins containing church news.

"According to Michigan Bell, this is the only system of its kind in use," said Nelson Bradford, superintendent of the Sunday school. "It took some doing on their part to accomplish it. They put in a telephone line from our building to theirs and then we connected the end of it to our sound system."

This is a lot better than the system the groups first tried. Earlier the pastor's words were carried by an ordinary telephone, which at best could be heard by only one or two people.

"We wanted to minister to more people and help them," explained Bradford.

"They talk on the Scriptures and about God and I like to hear it over and over," said Mrs. Ray, a Plymouth resident for more than 20 years. "That's what I come for."

She added: "I'm not interested in a special denomination. I go to hear them all. After all, we're all going to the same place to serve the Lord."

Mrs. Lottie Bower said, "I like to

listen to it because it helps."

"In a wheelchair I can't get to my church," she pointed out. "So I enjoy it here—it makes me feel better."

Mrs. Bower, a Plymouth resident for 46 years, grew up on a farm near Clayton, Mich.

Clare Fisher, who many years ago was a Sunday school teacher in Detroit, keeps his hand in by gathering with the group at the speaker.

"I like the sermons," he said. "I like the way the pastor puts things to the public."

Mrs. Nellie Darnell likes to attend the weekly sermons because "I was taught that way in Ohio."

Like Mrs. Ray, she lived on a big farm. "I had to drive in a horse and buggy to church about two miles away," she said.

"You get used to going to church—it's just natural to go," she continued. "If you don't go, you feel something is wrong. Sermons are longer than they used to be but the content is about the same."

Women will talk on mission work

Seven women who participated in mission projects during the summer will speak on their work at the 7 p.m. service Sunday, Aug. 25 in the Ward United Presbyterian Church of Livonia.

Joyce Andres, Florence Vance, Geraldine Kenny, Kay Waller, Virgie Cotner, Marion Mansfield and Donna Russell are the speakers. All but Miss Russell are members of the church.

Miss Andres spent six weeks on a mission project with Teen Missions of Merritt Island, Fla.

She was one of 25 young people from the U.S. and Canada who volun-

teered their services to build an orphanage in Haiti for children who have had nothing but a hut for their home. During the six weeks the young people completed the entire first floor of a two-story building.

The other women chose to go north to Palmer, Alaska, for their volunteer missionary project. They spent two weeks at the Arctic Mission Station painting classrooms, houses and dormitories as well as mending and cataloging books for their library.

Church potential aid to retarded

The church is one of the community's most important untapped resources for the mentally retarded, a University of Michigan social work professor maintains.

"It is crucial to involve the church not only in planning and implementing services for the retarded but in serving as their advocates in the community," says Dr. Robert Segal, program director for social work at the U-M Institute for the Study of Mental Retardation and Related Disabilities.

Writing in the current issue of the Journal of the National Association for the Retarded, Segal lists pastoral counseling, religious education, information and referral, and participation in worship services as examples of church sponsored programs that can be and are being developed.

"PART OF almost all religious beliefs is the framework of the practice of charity," he notes.

"To the Hebrews, helping one's fellow man was considered a social duty, and the religious man was one of social action. Christianity too has placed clear emphasis on personal involvement and service to mankind."

"The church has clearly recognized its mandate to serve the needy. Many hospitals, schools and welfare agencies have been established under its auspices and continue to meet some of the community's needs."

"But because social needs are great and seemingly never ending, the church has had to set priorities. Its general lack of involvement with the mentally retarded reflected attitudes held by society at large."

"Historically, society saw the mentally retarded, particularly the severe-

ly retarded person, as totally helpless and repulsive," Segal explains. "Society usually rejects those persons who are considered sources of embarrassment. Placing the retarded in large, isolated institutions appeared to be a quick, easy solution."

During the past decade, there have been increased efforts to retain in the community those mentally retarded persons who could conceivably lead semi-independent, productive and meaningful lives, Segal says, adding:

"But to assist them, the community needs more diagnostic and evaluation clinics; day care programs; special education classes; small group residential homes; vocational placements and sheltered workshops; financial resources; family counseling, recreation and medical programs. The church can become involved in many of these areas."

Mormons and Boy Scouts hit for racism, cheating

The Mormon Church is triumphantly preparing to accept ticket requests for guided tours through its massive new \$18 million temple near Washington.

This latest in a series of national denominational shrines is a towering and impressive edifice, strategically located on the well-traveled Capital Beltway. It gives the motorist the impression that he has been re-routed to Camelot.

But a crisis has erupted in Utah which could turn this temple's dedication in November into a giant protest rally—as well as wrecking a good segment of the Boy Scouts of America.

For it has been discovered that all black boy scouts are being systematically denied the right to become senior patrol leaders in all troops sponsored by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

HEADQUARTERS of the LDS in Salt Lake City has issued a statement which confirms this policy, that only deacons quorum presidents can be senior patrol leaders.

Because the Mormon priesthood has been denied to all blacks of African descent (at least all but one, named Elijah Abel, a black mormon in Nauvoo, Ill. 1810-1884), black boy scouts have no chance to become senior patrol leaders.

At national Boy Scouts of America headquarters in North Brunswick, N.J., an all-day meeting produced from Chief Scout Executive Alden ("The Iron Duke") Barber the following statement:

"We recognize that this is a very sensitive issue. Until we have had further discussions with the general authorities of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, we feel it would be imprudent to comment at this time."

But on the very same day as this statement, the LDS headquarters explained:

"The Boy Scouts of America knows our church's policy and has approved that policy."

Furthermore, noted the LDS very cleverly: "Lord Baden Powell (founder of the Boy Scouts) said that 'Scouting should be religion-related'."

THE BSA HIGH command was only recently involved in another horrendous scandal called "Boypower '76," in which membership figures were falsified in cities across the nation. Richard Fisher, BSA director of public relations, when asked about this massive dishonesty in membership figures, conceded "That's on the record."

Fisher also conceded that Boy Scout local councils across the country receive federal funding. But when asked about reports that the BSA's \$115,000,000 budget has an \$8.5 million deficit, Fisher replied:

"I can't substantiate that,"—and he declined to comment further.

WILL THE FEDERAL government—as well as other religious denominations that sponsor Boy Scout troops—tolerate the BSA headquarters' acquiescence to racial discrimination?

Or, mindful of how strongly Jesus felt about those who harm children (St. Matthew 18:6), will the other denominations take appropriate action and disassociate themselves from the BSA (with its "God and Country" programs) unless BSA orders an end to the confounding of Mormon sponsorship with Mormon control of scouting?

That this would be difficult is obvious in the LDS statement's reminder that there are "27,000 Mormon boy scouts — 80 per cent participation

of all Mormon boys in scouting, as compared to 30 per cent of all non-Mormon boys."

At the same time, BSA is chartered as the Boy Scouts of America (not the Boy Scouts of Utah). And the scandal of any 12-year-old boy being systematically denied the right to any scouting post simply because of the skin pigment he was born with is a cruelty which is un-Christian, un-Hebrew and un-American.

Girl celebrates first Saturday Bat Mitzvah

Andrea Rosen is a 14-year-old trailblazer.

She is the very first girl at Adat Shalom Synagogue in Farmington to celebrate her Bat Mitzvah at a Saturday morning service.

Up to now, girls were only allowed to ascend the bimah on Friday evenings. Saturday observances were reserved for boys.

"It's very exciting and challenging. I feel excited to be the first one doing something like this," she said.

She admits that many men in the congregation have told her they don't approve at all of the innovation.

"The kids are more accepting about it and just shrug it off," she said.

RABBI JACOB Segal and Seymour Rosenbloom call the change a move to provide for greater involvement for young women in Shabbat services.

"The ritual committee and board of trustees adopted our new policy one year ago," Rabbi Rosenbloom said.

Under the new procedures, the young woman has to have reached the age of 14 and completed Judaic studies through at least one year of secondary education.

"Under these regulations," the rabbi said, "the Bat Mitzvah ceremony now becomes exactly equivalent to the ceremony of Bar Mitzvah for boys."

ACCORDING TO the rabbi, a number of young women are currently in the process of preparing for their Bat Mitzvah in the coming months.

Andrea, who expects to continue her Jewish education through high school, has been an active member of Adat Shalom's United Synagogue Youth Group.

Last year she served as president of its junior unit.

When she ascends the bimah this Saturday to chant the Haftarah she has studied so hard to learn, Andrea will have the moral support of other members of her family participating in the day's service with her.

And just as she is a trailblazer in her synagogue, so is she an example

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






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Jan Moore is a state 'first'

"I really don't see any problems in having a woman athletic director. The man director couldn't go in the women's locker rooms and it will be just the opposite now," commented Gould.

THE NEW AD attended Flint Man-deville High School and graduated from Eastern Michigan University in 1958. Her first physical education assignment was at Trenton Junior High and then came the move to Garden City and Cambridge Junior High.

The year 1966 saw Mrs. Moore make the move to East High.

"There was no sports program at all for the girls when I first came,"

she commented. "I opened a basketball and intramural program."

The girls sports card has since expanded to include track, volleyball, swimming and tennis. Basketball, track and volleyball are on the varsity level with swimming and tennis set to go varsity next year.

"I know I am really going to have to work at this job the first year," she said.

"I am not taking on this assignment as a challenge or anything for the women's movement. For me it is simply something I want to do and something I think I can handle."

"I think if there is any challenge at all - it will be in rebuilding the men's

track and wrestling program here at East.

"THE GIRLS program is building and the men have more or less accepted it. There is no longer a backseat for girls sports. The interest is there."

"I guess there will be a few eyes on me to see how I handle both sports and if I don't do a respectable job - I guess that is when the challenge part would enter the picture."

"I am really excited about the job and Mr. Bartlo has been a tremendous help already."

Score one for Garden City East and the appointment of the first woman AD in the state.

Grid coach Lovich named Franklin AD

When Franklin High Athletic Director of seven years, Walt Cosens, died suddenly last spring - a victim of a heart attack during a paddleball game, the entire coaching staff commented that the task of filling his shoes would be one of the hardest around.

That task has been met and the man taking over is the one Franklin coach who perhaps stood the closest to Cosens and took the death the hardest.

Franklin varsity football coach for six seasons, George Lovich has been appointed the athletic director.

The "unwritten rule" in Livonia where an athletic director cannot coach a team will go by the wayside this season with Lovich blowing the main whistle for his seventh year.

The lateness of the new assignment made it impossible to appoint a new football coach.

Lovich, who was the Observer's grid coach-of-the-year in 1973, has a 40-9-1 mark in the past six seasons and before that worked four years under Bob Bentley who was then athletic director and football coach for Franklin High.

The 36 year-old Lovich, his wife Mary Ann Mosier and his children, Ann Marie (10), Lisa (8) and Kath-

leen (5) have gone along with George's decision to turn to administration.

"My daughter Lisa doesn't really like me getting out of coaching," commented George. "She says that she

likes to come and cheer my boys on. I just explained to her that they will still be my boys and she can still cheer them all on."

"I guess this is something that I have always thought about doing," he added. "I like to organize. Heck, I have been in the classroom some 13 years now and it's about time for a change."

After graduating from California State College, Pa., in '61, Lovich moved on to Lincoln Park high school, taught in the Detroit system for two years, obtained his masters from Eastern Michigan University in '63 and started at Franklin that same year.

"Taking on this job will be one of the toughest things for me in that I will be attempting to carry on with what Walt really got rolling around here," commented Lovich. "This job didn't make Walt - Walt made the job. I just hope to get out of the programs what he did."

"I really have to believe the closeness of our staff will keep our program here at Franklin the tops around."

"And as far as football is concerned, I'll never be away from it. I will be involved somehow or another."

Schoolcraft wrestling coach moves on to Illinois State

Larry Meyer, head wrestling coach at Schoolcraft Community College in Livonia the past four years, has been named to a similar position at Illinois University.

Meyer succeeds Robert Koehler, who resigned after 10 seasons to teach fulltime in the ISU department of physical education. Meyer's appointment is subject to approval of the Board of Regents.

Meyer is a former Southern Illinois University wrestler who won the Interstate Conference 191-pound title as a

senior in '62 and won 177-pound titles in the Great Plain AAU and Midwest NCAA regional tournaments.

A native of Mattoon, Ill., Meyer entered coaching as an assistant at Proviso East high school. Meyer was then head wrestling and golf coach at Peoria Richwood high school from 1963-65. It was then on to the University of Missouri and University of Colorado as assistant coach for two years before making the move to Schoolcraft.

Under Meyer, Schoolcraft compiled

successive records of 9-3, 17-2, 13-4 and 17-5. His teams won two conference titles and placed fourth in the 1974 National junior college tournament.

Meyer coached the United States Wrestling Federation national team which toured the southern United States to compete against the Japanese nationals in '72.

Meyer received his master's degree from Southern Illinois in '62 and his doctor's degree from the University of Missouri in '69.

Glenn-Thurston gridders hopeful at Pennsylvania

The 1974 University of Pennsylvania gridiron card could be carrying two area names on that starting offensive roster.

Thurston High's Bob Graustein and John Glenn's Marty Banks are cur-

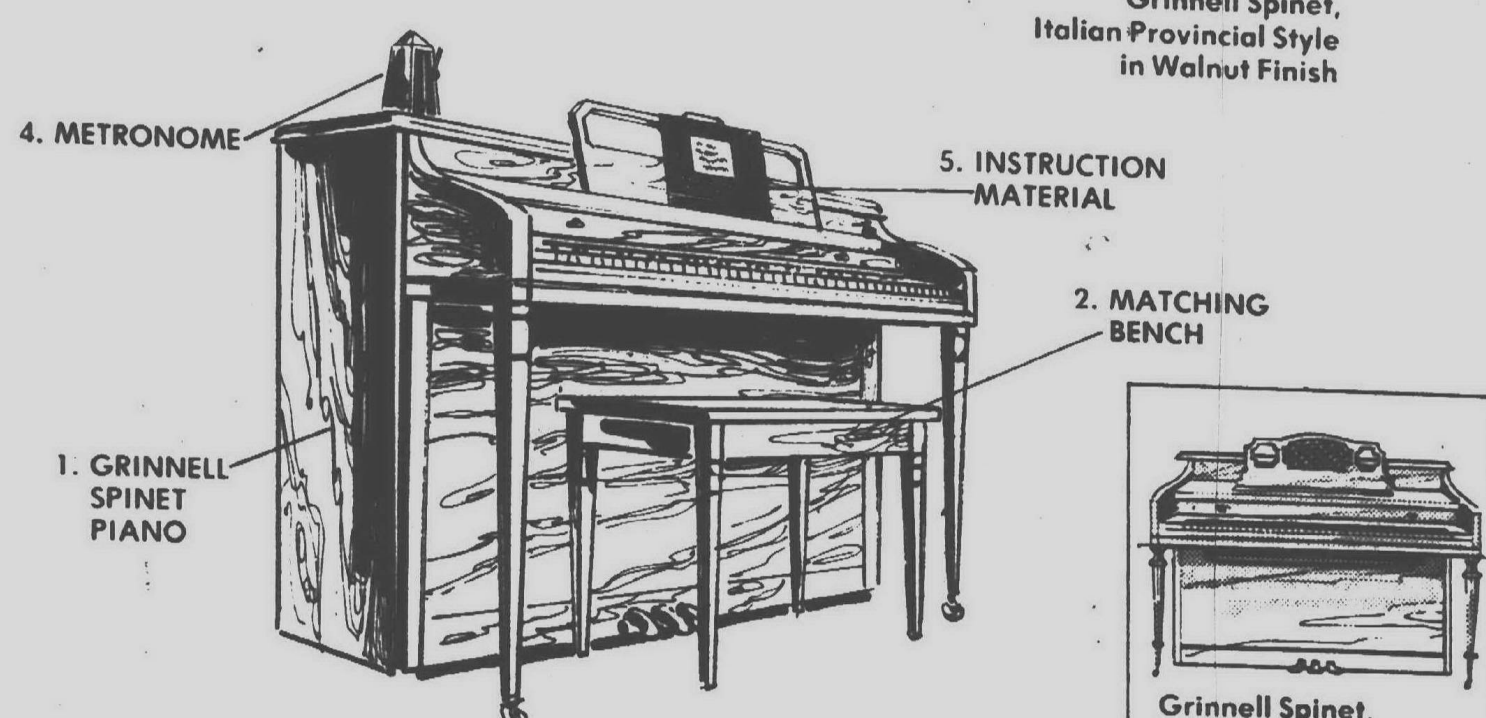

The deadline for men's entries is Wednesday, Sept. 11 with the first round pairings and times available at the Whispering Willows clubhouse on Thursday afternoon.

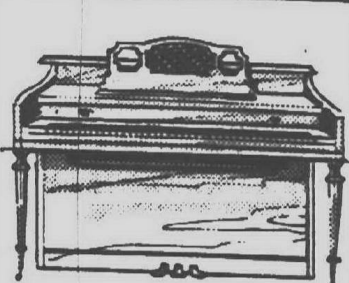

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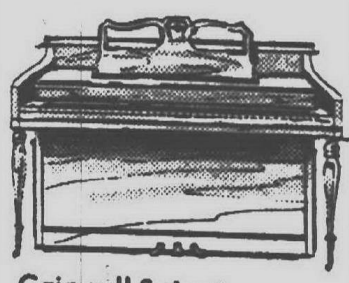
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Turf Tips, Quips

Hunch bettors missed one of the big-
gest parlays of the year Saturday at
Wolverine Raceway when Driver Ray
Remmen, who hails from Saskatoon,
Saskatchewan in the Canadian north-
west, won the eighth, ninth and 10th
races for Canadian owners.

But those who like to wager on the
No. 1 horse had their best opportunity
... all three of Remmen's victories
were rail horses.

Game Baron, owned by Eric and
Harry Wheby, of Dartmouth, Nova
Scotia, won the eighth for a \$10 mu-
tuel. Quick Baron, with the same
owners, was on the wire first in the
ninth and paid \$14. Then Remmen
made the night complete by winning
the 10th with Steady Boots, also Cana-
dian owned, who went off at better
than 17-1 odds and had a price of \$37.

A parlay on the trio would have
paid \$2,465.20 and all for the price of
a \$2 ticket. Just to add a bit of spice
to the frosting, Steady Boots was one
of the key horses in the final race tri-
fecta which paid a whopping \$28,559 to
two lucky ticket holders.

THE THOROUGHBREDS may take
a back seat at the Detroit Race
Course but such is not true of the
standardbreds, better known as
pacers and trotters. After the amaz-
ing spring meeting at Hazel Park,
there were many that predicted Wolve-
rine would have a sad season.

But they didn't reckon with the pro-
motion ability of Vice President and
General Manager Dick Wilson and the
persuasive powers of Racing Secre-
tary Bill Connors. The former ar-
ranged some promotions to call atten-
tion to the racing at Wolverine and
the latter induced owners of top
horses to ship to the track from every
section of the land.

The combination of promotion and
excellent programs has Wolverine in
the midst of the finest season of any
Michigan harness racing plant in the
late summer and early fall dates.
No harness racing track had been

able to hit the million-dollar mark in
the late summer and early fall ... that
is none until it recorded one a week
ago Saturday and then came right
back again last Saturday with
\$1,029,231, an all-time time high.

Wagering for the week was
\$4,526,158, the most for a single week
in Wolverine history and boosted the
nightly average handle to \$725,541, far
ahead of the figures for the same num-
ber of nights a year ago last spring.

AVERAGE NIGHTLY handle for
the week was \$752,693 and that is an-
other record of some sorts. Remem-
ber a few years back when a harness
racing track in Michigan thought it
was a big thing when it went through
an entire season with an average of
slightly more than \$5,000.

The attendance is at an all-time
high with a turnstile count of 171,051
for 22 nights for an average of 7,775.
That's something like 19.2 per cent
ahead of the statistics for the same
time in 1973.

So, forget the tears folks, Wolverine
already has passed the million mark
twice in 22 nights and that's some-
thing Hazel Park wasn't able to do all
last season when it had the fall dates.
It was close on three or four occa-
sions but couldn't quite make it.

PERHAPS HAZEL PARK General
Manager Harold Duris and Mutuel
Manager Gene Tarleton, who loudly
made fun of the records set by Wolve-
rine in the 1973 spring meeting, as
they beat one after another, can take
a few lessons. They'll have the fall
dates again in another year or so and
they could well study the Wilson tac-
tics ... in fact they'll probably need
them to hit a million in a single night.

After watching the performance of
Jack Van Berg's stable at Hazel Park
over the weekend, one wonders if he
didn't stop off in Chicago while en-
route to Michigan and drop off most
of the better horses. The ones entered
from his stable in the past few days
weren't exactly champions. In fact,
most would have been better off if
they had shipped on to Cleveland in-
stead of stopping in this area.

All of which makes one wonder why
a trainer does this. What makes this
situation even more odd is the fact
that Jack is training the large Shin-
rone Stable, owned by Bill Bridge of
Bloomfield Hills, and didn't even
bring the best of that group here.

Despite this this Hazel Park is en-
joying a season that could go on and
set all kinds of records during the
first 90 days, after that the meet-
ing will drop back to an ordinary thor-
oughbred session with many of the bet-
ter stables taking off for New Orleans
and points south.

THERE WAS A TIME when a De-
troit track had a million dollar
handle, it was big news. So take a
look at what happened over the week-
end. Wolverine has a million dollars
Saturday night and Hazel Park almost
hits \$1.4 million on each Saturday and
Sunday.

That should be an indication employ-
ment is at a high level since it seems
that plenty of folks have plenty of
money to spend and those that like to
spend it on horse races are doing it.
There are the same familiar faces at
the day and night races for every pro-
gram.

Those who were wondering if Sun-
day racing would catch on need only

to make a trip to Hazel Park on any
of the Sabbaths and see the en-
thusiasm of folks as they watch the
races, make their ways to the mutuel
windows, study the various racing pub-
lications to get information on horses
and then take their seats.

It's apparent that many housewives,
who can't get their husbands to take
them to the races during the week,
are making the most of the Sundays.
And the day of Mom staying home
with the kids while Pop hops off to
the races are all over ... Mom and
the kids jump in the car with Dad
and they all take off for the afternoon
activities.

THERE MAY BE MORE young-
sters in the stands than should be,
judging from the squealing and crying
during the late afternoon, but it's a
day out for all and they enjoy it, even
if Mom and Pop wind up carrying the
little ones out of the park in their
arms while they nap. It may be differ-
ent from the beach but all seem to
have fun even though a race track
isn't the coolest place to be on a hot
day and Sunday was a hot, muggy
day.

However, cold or hot, folks seem to
be able to find their way to the mu-
tuel windows. Hazel Park was over
\$1.4 million a week ago and almost hit
that total last Sunday. All of which
makes members of the mutuel clerks
union happy ... they receive double
time when the handle is over \$1.2 mil-
lion and 1 1/4 time if it falls below that
figure.

In three Sundays it failed to hit the
double time figure only on the open-
ing Sunday, since then it has been a
big day for the track and the union.
Both hope it continues until the end of






the first 90 days, then the meeting

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Livonia's Triple ABA League needs first-class revamping

Another area amateur baseball season has come to a close.

And that perennial power Redford, Bob Atkins and Company, closed the pages on perhaps the best season ever sported by any team in the area.

A 41-5 Redford Adray squad gave the Johnstown, Pa. Triple ABA Nationals a real shot, finished at two-all there, and wound up tied for sixth in the nation.

"Sure, we were disappointed at not going farther in the tourney," commented Atkins, whose club has won the Livonia loop the last 10 years and been in Johnstown eight of those years. "But it all boils down to the same story every year."

"We can get close with our neighborhood club but we just can't keep up in the finals against these good Triple ABA teams."

"Now don't get me wrong, I am a far step from knocking my kids. Hey, this was the best team ever to come out of this area and we finish sixth in the nation."

"You can only ask so much from a neighborhood team."

"Here we are, a Triple ABA team drawing from two Class A high schools and a township that is two miles wide and six miles long."

"All that the Livonia League will allow is three outsiders."

"That's great for area competition, but once we go out of the area we are going up against teams that have no restrictions, unlimited recruiting measures."

"Year end and year out, the same teams in Washington, Baltimore, New Orleans and Detroit make it to the Johnstown finals. All these teams have unlimited recruiting-no restrictions."

"Johnstown is what this thing is all about. The people in charge here in Livonia just aren't concerned about Johnstown and how we do in the nationals."

"Our record is good at Johnstown for a community team but I know our competition and it's just not fair to our kids."

"We don't have to go as far as no restrictions here in the Livonia Adray League but we do have to open things up. Something or someone has to give."

"There has always been a conflict between Adray and Connie Mack ball

and it is obvious that the Connie Mack (now called Berry League) is watered down. Look at our three teams that went to the state finals and wound up with 2-6 marks overall.

"This Adray is good baseball and the trip to Johnstown is what it's all about. These other teams we face like Baltimore and Washington have played something like 70 to 90 games before coming to Johnstown."

"And here we sit in Livonia with a 24-game league schedule and a team roster limited to just three outsiders and the reasons we are given to everything is that we have to co-ordinate with the Connie Mack."

"We can't and won't be able to work on the same level as Connie Mack. We can't have the conflicts."

"A good league is going to have to center around 18 and 19 year-olds. Every so often you will have a 17-year-old enter the picture but we can't have any conflict with the Mack play."

"The people in charge of the Livonia circuit just haven't realized that if the restrictions are loosened up in the Adray loop, the Connie Mack can do nothing but improve."

"Let's face it, the Adray league is a league for winners."

"But the way things are being run in Livonia - I guess the people in charge just don't want us to be that competitive. The Livonia League is noted throughout the state as being the one with the most troubles most of them stemming from the residency and restriction rules."

"The kids are always trying to jump and I can't say that I really blame them. Look, for the last 10 years Redford has won the league and a dynasty is good for those only in power but is bad for the league. Kids that haven't been playing for Redford and want to win know they are restricted, they can't legally jump teams."

"Our kids in the league are locked in. They have to play for the city

team they live in. This residency rule causes more problems in Livonia than any other rule in the state."

"Sure, around here Redford has looked like world beaters but is literally impossible for us to come up with a sound club with just three outsiders."

"The community concept of this league is going to have to give ground to good sound baseball."

"Nobody wants to see two donkeys play and this is what has happened with a few of the clubs in our league - nobody really cares to see them play."

"People in this area want to see good baseball and this is obvious by the crowds we drew in the regionals against Birmingham, Ala. and Buffalo, N.Y."

"This Adray League needs some changes. For instance, nobody in Redford played on two teams this summer. It was either Connie Mack or Adray."

"A kid that plays on both is surely going to look down on the Connie Mack play. You can count the number of good Connie Mack teams we had in this area this year on one hand."

"Here we are attempting to upgrade all of our programs and at the same time watering down our Connie Mack teams. I have proposed the Adray going to seven outsiders and this alone has to strengthen the Connie Mack but my answer is obvious."

"Look at the area teams now in Plymouth and Livonia for example. You try to tell me that Plymouth has enough talent to field a good Triple ABA club and I tell you hogwash Plymouth wound up with just four kids on that team from Plymouth after other area cities released kids. Why Plymouth even had five from Redford."

"And a city like Livonia, which should field two Triple ABA teams couldn't even come up with 11 from that city for a team. Lifting the restrictions couldn't do anything but improve both the Triple ABA and Connie Mack play."

"Over at the Livonia Recreation office, Bob Schwarz says that he will not open the league because of community pressure."

"First of all, this is not a Livonia League and a lot of people have this

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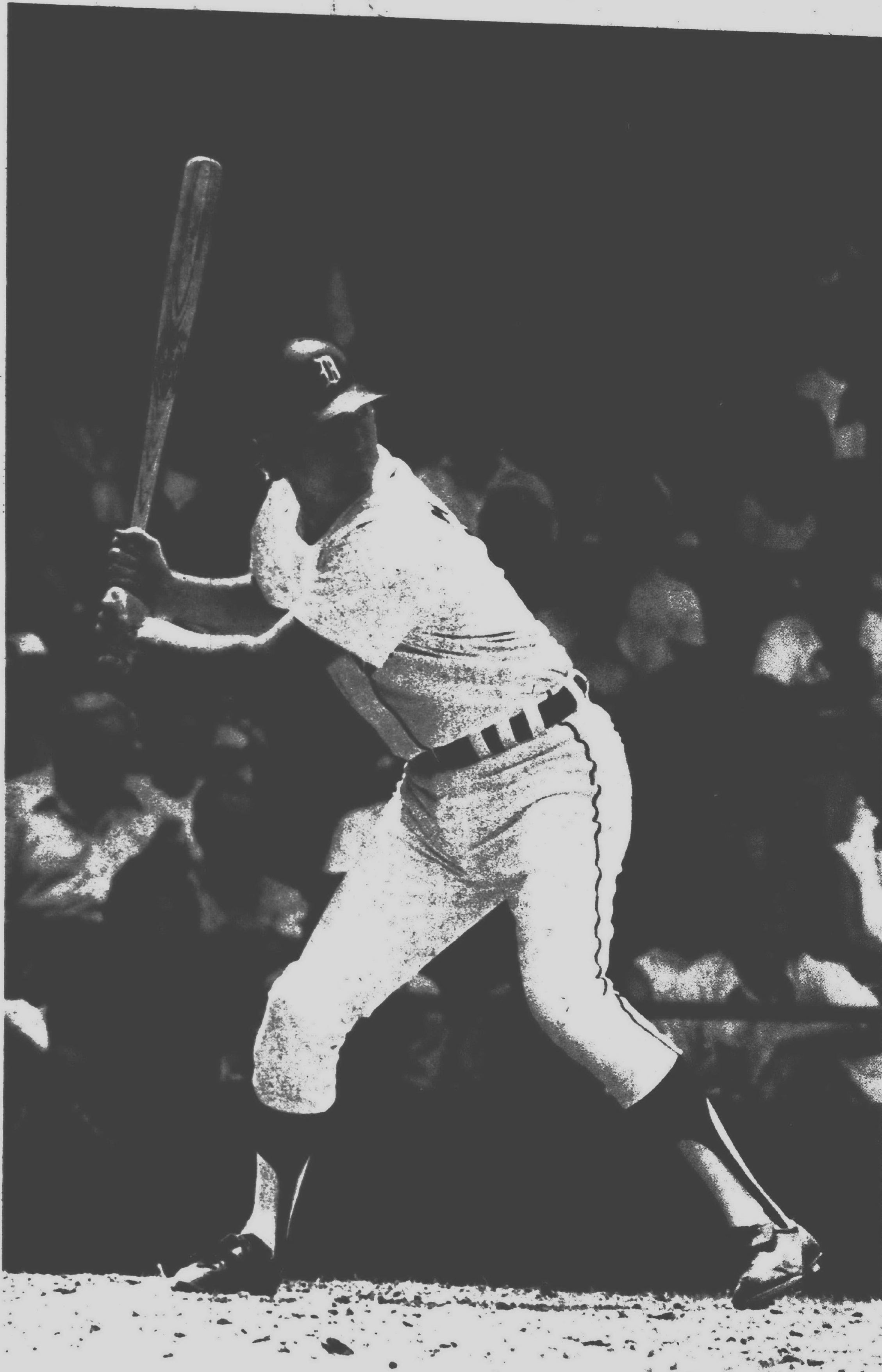

New history offerings at Orchard Ridge

FARMINGTON HILLS—Among history department classes at the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College are offerings dealing with minorities in history—most notably women, blacks, and American Indians.
