## Fall Festival's crowd sets attendance, appetite records

Perfect weather, hungry folks and a period of inflation that finds most everyone with a pocketful of money... all tied together to make the 1974 Fall Festival the most successful in history.

Before the end of the four day celebration, festival officials estimated more than 100,000 people had visited the downtown business section and they left quite a bit of their cash there before leaving for their homes.

Matter of fact, the stores reported more business at this festival than in a long time... so it was one of those annual celebrations that worked out for the best of all participating organizations and a few others that didn't care to participate officially but did manage to do a bit of selling for the good of their organizations.

The Rotarians, who generally get up at the crack of dawn to start things rolling for their chicken barbecue and roasted corn dinners, followed that pattern again this year and it's well they did.

The Festival, which is built around the Rotary Club functions on Sunday, hit its biggest climax with the sale of 16,000 chicken dinners.

That's more dinners than the Plymouth community had people when the first Festival was held back in 1958. It's a slight barometer to a community activity that has become the talk of the midwest. Would-be promoters in other sections come in each year to see why Plymouth has been so successful.

They have quickly discovered it is due to the tremendous pride and spirit of cooperation the entire community takes in making this annual event second to none.

It takes a year of planning and about six months of doing but when the final figures are shown, Plymouth has done it again.

Folks realized this was going to be a year to remember from the moment the Michigan state lottery drawing was made Thursday morning until the final notes of the entertainers were heard Sunday night.

There were about 1,500 on hand for the lottery show and for all in attendance it was exactly that. There were few who held lucky tickets but for the majority it was an enjoyable morning.

The Plymouth chapter of the Business and Professional Women started the ball rolling at noon Thursday with the traditional German dinner. It was the most delicious they have ever offered but for some unknown reason it wasn't a sellout, the only one of the four days.

However, the gals did hand out 3,000 dinners and that has to be a big day

regardless of whether they had some left or not.

The Lions had their day Friday with the fish dinner and sold some 3,000 during the afternoon and evening, running out of cole slaw twice and quickly replacing it. The figures for the day were 1,200 pounds of fish, 1,000 pounds of French fries and 500 pounds of cole slaw.

The Kiwanians and Jaycees took over the spotlight Saturday with the former holding their fall pancake and sausage program in the Masonic Temple and the latter disposing of 2,365 beef dinners in the evening.

The Kiwanians aren't complaining about the 2,386 they served but feel they could do better if they had larger facilities for cooking.

So there it is. Everything literally sold like hot cakes and even they went over big. Everyone had a big time, everyone came out with a full stomach and the participating groups came out with full purses.

## Schools seek injunction against strike

PLYMOUTH—Acting with what Board President Dr. E. J. McClendon termed a "great deal of reluctance," the board of education voted Monday to seek a court injunction to force striking teachers back to work.

The move was unanimously approved at the regular meeting, which was moved to Plymouth-Salem High School auditorium to accommodate an overflow crowd of about 700 parents, teachers and students who came to question board members on the progress of negotiations.

According to school attorney John Thomas, a complaint requesting an injunction will be filed this week in Wayne County Circuit Court, with the court's ruling expected sometime next week.

"IN NO WAY should this move be construed by teachers as a way (for the board) to gain added leverage at the bargaining table," board member Thomas Yack told the audience. "It's not a threat to the Plymouth Education Association (PEA) or its negotiating team. It's our legal obligation, our responsibility to the school district, to get the children back in school as soon as possible."

PEA members met Tuesday in the Penn Theater to discuss the state of the strike and bargaining talks with their negotiators and board members George Lawton and Marcia Borowski

and board chief negotiator Norman Kee.

Asked if teachers would defy a court injunction, PEA president Margaret "Dolly" Carter said, "We'll cross that bridge when we come to it. I won't say it (defiance) hasn't been mentioned."

On the reason for the board's delay in filing the request for an injunction, Mrs. Carter said "Maybe they think we can settle. Or maybe they think the teachers will get antsy. That would be a mistake."

The Penn Theater meeting, which was closed to the press and the public, was picketed by about a dozen Allen and Smith School parents and students who called for open meetings and a return to work by the teachers.

"IT WAS A FRIENDLY group, there was no antagonism," board member Lawton said of the Penn meeting with teachers. "I think the teachers are ready to settle, there's more reason for it now than there was."

"We want a quick settlement like everyone else," said Mrs. Carter, "but the board has not moved from its position of Aug. 29. We've been close informally, but if it's not formal you can talk until doomsday. There's an ocean of difference between what's informally discussed and what's on the table."

Both teams were to meet with a state mediator on Wednesday, with the PEA scheduling another general membership meeting this morning.

According to Mrs. Carter, a new contract settlement still hinges on economic issues such as teacher salaries and fringe benefits. The teachers are seeking a higher cost of living increase than that offered by the school board.

Following the board's regular meeting Monday night, McClendon set aside an hour for comments from the audience on the strike and its causes. Speakers were asked to abide by a three-minute limit.

BOARD MEMBER Gary Mirto, who was absent from the meeting due to a death in his family, sent a letter outlining his position which McClendon read to the gathering. "The strike is a violation of the laws of this state," he wrote. He asked the community for patience, good faith and support "for its elected board."

Mrs. Borowski said that should both sides agree to submit to binding arbitration by an outside mediator, the board has set a timetable which calls for a final contract agreement within one month.

"They (the teachers) could beat you to the punch if they went back to school tomorrow," said parent Richard Lalley. "But they're hiding something. If they have a gripe let them bring it before the public. You (the teachers) have to have the public on your side, because we're paying you."

"The PEA is not going to negotiate in public or throw collective bargaining before an open forum," said Mrs. Carter. She denounced the board for what she termed its "devisive, smoke-screen tactics in the press."

"THE SCHOOL BOARD must stop trying to escape its responsibility. It's more concerned with saving face through third-party intervention. We're not throwing mud or rocks, but we're standing even more firmly."

"What about the responsibility of teachers to teach our kids?" asked one parent. "I can't explain to my five-year-old son why our teachers won't teach. I've seen what the teachers were offered and what they're asking. There could be a much larger compromise."

"The PEA owes the children of this

### Heights' commission filing near

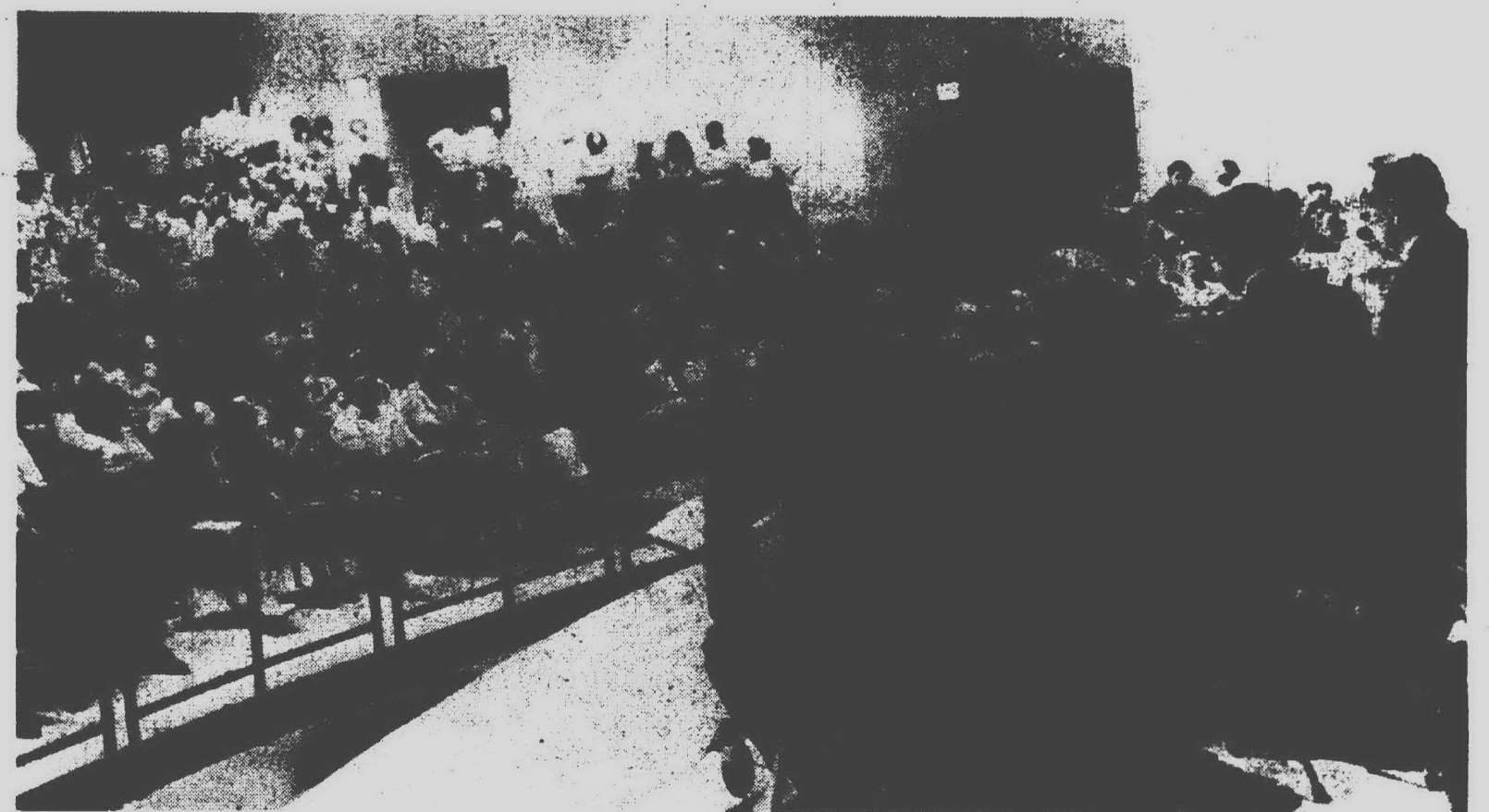
PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—With the filing deadline less than a week away, 14 Plymouth Township residents had taken out nominating petitions as of Wednesday to become candidates for the charter commission of the proposed City of Plymouth Heights, according to Township Clerk Helen Richardson.

Township voters will elect nine of the candidates to the new charter commission in the Nov. 5 general election. The commission would be authorized to create a charter for making the township a city.

The petitions, which require the signatures of 20 registered voters, must be filed with the Wayne County clerk no later than Tuesday, Sept. 17. Mrs. Richardson noted that petitions may be turned in at township hall, from which they will be delivered to the county clerk by Plymouth Heights Mayor Pro-Tem John D. McEwen.

# The impact women have on literature

What does it mean to be a woman and a creative writer?

If you are interested in a discussion and indepth study of this question, Schoolcraft College is introducing English 170 "Modern Literature for and about Women," which will explore and analyze the works of female writers.

The class is offered for three credits in day and evening sections on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 1 to 2 p.m. and Wednesdays from 7 to 10 p.m.

Ferency is an associate professor of criminal justice at Michigan State University. He has a long history as a lawyer involved in protecting constitutional rights and civil liberties.

A municipal court clerk for Oak Park, Ms. McNulty has been a political organizer in the peace movement and in grape, lettuce and Farah pants boycotts.

McClure teaches political science at Lansing Community College. In 1968, he was fired as Michigan's deputy secretary of state for his opposition to the Indochina war and his support of an anti-war candidate for president.

Ms. Jobs is a feminist with a background of activism for the professional rights of women. She is a partner in Detroit's all-woman law firm of Jobs and LeBost.

The women's theme is the product of Schoolcraft English instructors Joanne Stein, Marilyn Huss and Donna Price Minock and a lot of interested students.

"Literary masterpieces by women are neglected," says Ms. Minock. "Anyone that doubts that has only to remember any literature class they've ever taken, then count the women writers on the list of required reading. There is a need to look at literature from a female perspective."

THE CLASS is generating a lot of excitement among the faculty, and the women hope those students who expressed interest in the idea last spring will follow through when registration begins Aug. 27.

The course will emphasize reading and discussion of short fiction, novels, poetry, and essays of American and British women writers of the 19th and 20th centuries, explains Ms. Minock.

"The class is designed to provide a perspective on women and their experiences by women authors. Most literature does not include women's issues," believes Ms. Minock.

"A woman can find solutions to many problems by looking at fictional characters who share her situation, then examining a solution without actually having to try that solution herself."

MS. STEIN, who has been in the English department since 1967, will teach the evening section.

She received a BA from Mercy College of Detroit, and masters degrees from Syracuse University and the University of Michigan.

Ms. Minock will lead the day session. She received a BA in English from the University of Chicago and a master's from Purdue University. She taught at Purdue before coming to Schoolcraft in 1967.

The reading selections will depend on the instructor. For the day class Ms. Minock has chosen "The Dollmaker" by Harriet Arnow, "The Awakening" by Kate Chopin and various works by Virginia Woolf, Sylvia Plath, Anne Sexton and Nicki Giovanni.

"They all address themselves to a woman's role in contemporary society."

"The Dollmaker" is the story of about a young woman who comes from the south and settles in Detroit. It reveals a woman's own personal

struggle of trying to adjust to a working class society," explains Ms. Minock.

The Chopin novel deals with the sexual problems a woman encounters in marriage, the responsibilities a woman has for children and what they mean in relation to her creative life. "It's all very applicable," says Ms. Minock.

The short stories and poetry have been selected to help women look at themselves in terms of their cultural position and how to deal with themselves as physical persons.

THE TRIO is hoping the women's theme will spread into other subject areas. They would eventually like to establish a women's studies department at Schoolcraft.

"I think the interest is there for such a project," says Ms. Minock.

The women's literature class was developed last spring and passed quickly through the curriculum committee at Schoolcraft.

"I was surprised how fast the whole idea developed," Ms. Minock said.

The class will last 16 weeks and it "transfers everywhere."

Ms. Minock, a former member of the Detroit Women's Coalition, is now active in the Livonia Chapter of NOW (National Organization of Women).

"I'm still active in the women's movement but now I'm letting my perspective start to dominate my teaching. I find I take women students a lot more seriously now than when I first started teaching."

"As a wife and mother of two children I know what it's like to have two careers."

Fall Classes at Schoolcraft start Sept. 3.

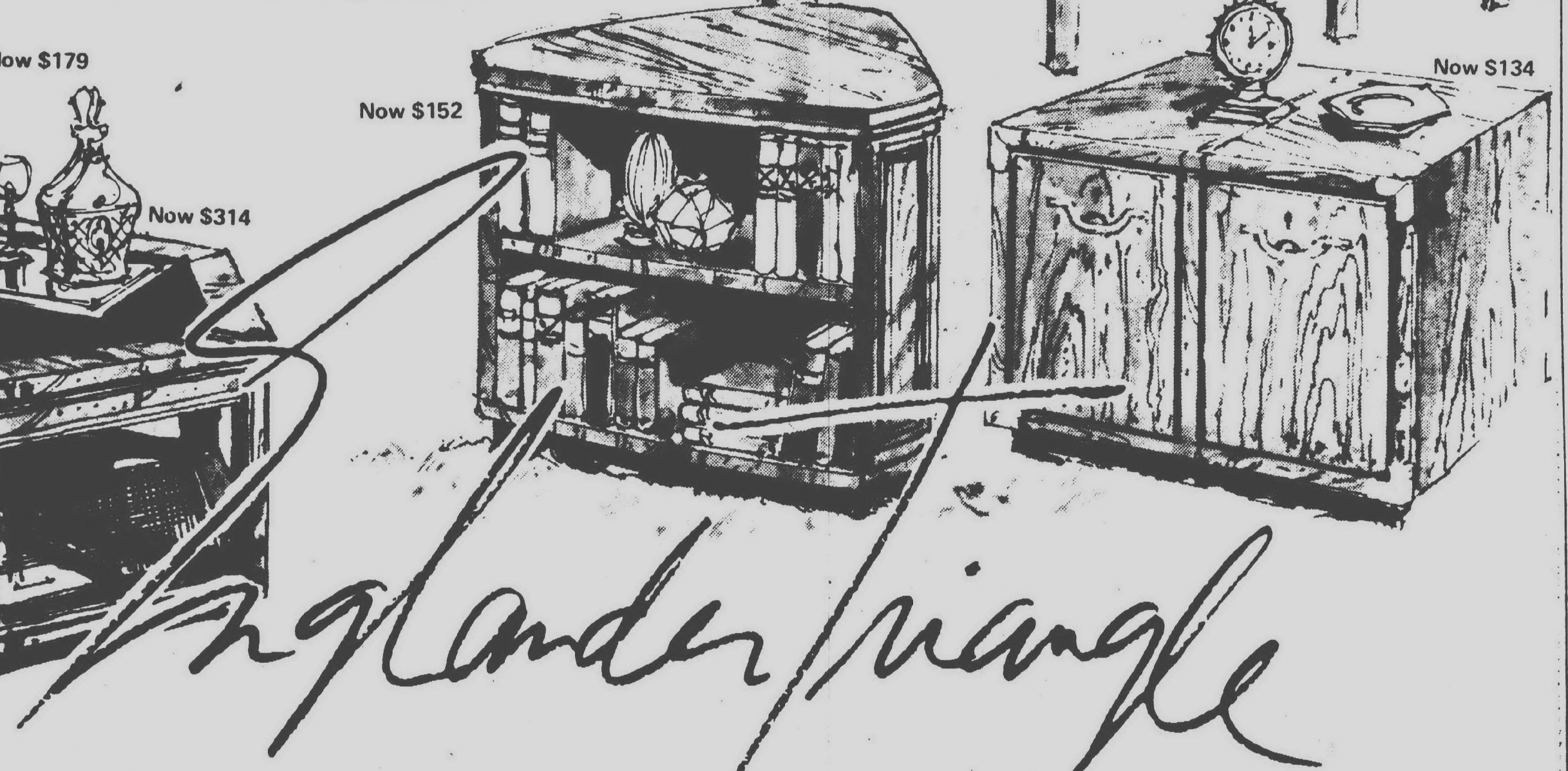

# State rejects Pilgrim Towers site for funding

Plymouth city commissioners at their recent study session seemed both disappointed and disoriented by the rejection by the state of the proposed site for the Pilgrim Towers senior citizens housing development.

The site was turned down for environmental reasons and because of its proximity to the C&O railroad tracks at Ann Arbor Trail.

After three attempts to bail out the project financially, the commission was informed by the Michigan State Housing Development Authority that the location did not meet the guidelines set up by the state and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The project was planned by the Pilgrim Towers Non-Profit Housing Corp., whose executive director is James Houk.

"Someone down the line is not giving us the facts," said Joe Bida, who a little over a month ago was among the four commissioners who voted to rescue the project for the third time by picking up expiring options on parcels at the proposed site.

Twice earlier the commission had voted to pay interest up to a maximum of \$10,000 on these options to hold the property.

"We've been misled, maybe not intentionally," said John Moehle, who voted against picking up the options. "So far, the city has put more money after more money. If the property is not acceptable because of its proximity to the tracks, I wonder if its tax evaluation is correct."

In its rejection of the site, the letter from the state not only mentioned the railroad but negative environmental factors. There is a factory at Hamilton and Ann Arbor Trail so that residential zoning would almost about the land zoned industrial.

Moehle continued by saying it was not his purpose to sabotage the project, but "we get a little information and then find that only part of it is true."

"Let's take steps so that we don't fumble the ball any more," he said. "If we agree the project is worthwhile let's make it a successful project. If we find it won't work, let's get out."

Commissioner Norbert Battermann, whose July vote favored the project wondered "why did these HUD standards never surface before?"

"Do they have a valid reason for rejection on these points?" he asked.

"I'd like to see what the HUD standards are."

make up your minds about what to do."

On Dec 23 the principal on the first loan must be paid or the contract entered into by the city will be defaulted. Then the city will merely have to pay not more than \$10,000 in interest and it will be out of the real estate business.

It could also pay off the land contract and then own the property, or it could continue to pay the interest.

"I think you should give Jim Houk and his group another 15 days or a month to find another location," Yockey continued. "We also ought to see what AMURCON has to say. I hate to see this project go down the drain."

AMURCON is a private corporation which has built a number of senior citizen and other low-cost housing developments.

"I think there is a dire need of senior citizen housing," said Bida. "We must find a place for the elderly people trying to get into Tonquish Creek Manor."

Yockey said he believed it was time to see if AMURCON wants to come in. "I think we ought to see what they can do to help us with this problem. They're pros."

Concluding the discussion of the senior citizens project, Yockey said that he would proceed with Houk and others to see if AMURCON was interested in taking on the Pilgrim Towers plan. He also will look into other housing locations and report back to the commission.

Following the meeting Mayor Beverly McAninch pointed out the state first informed the city the site was fine, but that they didn't have the final say. HUD did.

"SEMOG also approved it," she said. "The presence of the railroad tracks never entered the discussion. But I feel that HUD was, probably right on that. Older people wouldn't like to live near railroad tracks where a minimum of 24 trains pass each day."

Mrs. McAninch voted against the July proposal for continued financial help for the Pilgrim Towers project.

Commissioner John Cummings maintained that the controversial location is still a good parcel of property. "I don't think the railroad tracks make that much difference with modern construction methods that can shut out noise."

Mrs. McAninch believes the commission will first make an appeal to HUD in Chicago about changing its decision. Then it will consider the various options open to it.

## 'Loop Road' concept falling into disfavor

PLYMOUTH—Members of the student government at Plymouth Centennial Educational Park, responding to the strike of Plymouth teachers, released the following statement:

"In view of the current conflict between the Plymouth Education Association (PEA) and the Plymouth Community School Board, which has resulted in the teachers withholding their services, the students have been seriously overlooked."

"Due to the overwhelming concern about this unfortunate situation, the concerned students in both Plymouth-Salem and Plymouth-Canton High Schools have been meeting and discussing the conflict."

"One meeting included having representatives from both sides explain what the strike is all about to students."

"At this gathering, which was held in the Salem auditorium last Wednesday (Sept. 4), Mrs. Dolly Carter McMaster, from the teachers association, explained that negotiations, 'the art of compromising,' had become deadlocked with a table offer from the teachers being an average percentage raise of 2.25 in addition to their normal annual raise."

"Gary Mirto, representing the school board, stated the board was offering a raise of 7.5 per cent, and the

budget couldn't allow it to go any higher."

"Mrs. McMaster went on to say that negotiations are now just a 'powerplay or pressure game to get one or the other side to move.'"

"What has been neglected is that we, the students, in all levels of education (elementary, middle and high school) are caught in the midst of this 'game.'"

"Senior high school students are directly hurt in a number of ways."

"The strike is limiting those students who are graduating early (in January) and have plans for their future as soon as they get their diplomas."

"Applications for college might be made when it's too late."

"Athletes with possible scholarships on the line may not be offered them because they may not compete due to the fact that all athletic schedules might be halted."

"Money-making activities for all classes, that are vital for graduation purposes, are also limited."

"Summer jobs for students won't be there because they may be attending school during that time."

"On a more general level, all students will lose respect for their teachers as 'professionals.' Once-interested students will lose their enthusiasm toward school, with some failing to return (which is what resulted in last year's Detroit strike)."

"Although we should be attending classes, we still feel we are gaining an education, by seeing and learning that two adult groups are not mature enough to come to a compromise."

"We also feel as if both negotiating teams are treating the issues as large business corporations do, and not considering the extreme damage being done to us."

## Students say strike 'overlooks' them

PLYMOUTH—Three Plymouth city commissioners expressed feelings at a recent informal study session that building a loop road around the central business district might not be the best way for the city to spend its money.

Commissioners Joseph Bida, John Cummings and John Moehle all found fault with the idea of creating such a road. Agreeing to discuss the matter for only 15 minutes because of the lateness of the hour, the commissioners found adequate time to air a number of complaints.

"Let's conquer the parking problem and work on a viaduct and then maybe we can get to the loop road," said Cummings.

"It is important to develop the town, but I can't see that a loop road does this," said Moehle. "What is the magic formula of a loop road?"

Norbert Battermann contended that "a loop road is essential to expand the central business district."

"Business would expand to face the loop road," he said.

"Business hasn't even expanded to fill the downtown area," answered Moehle. "There are a lot of under utilized areas there."

"I think it will create a parking problem," said Bida. "I feel we are being sold a bill of goods on the loop

road. If you put up this road, traffic will be backed up."

Moehle stated the loop road idea has been around for many years. "If it is a good idea, why have we waited?" he asked. "If the project is good, we would have found the money to do it. I am for determining whether it is going to benefit us." "I think the loop road would benefit the city," said Battermann.

Bida answered, "I think \$500,000 can be better utilized elsewhere."

"The planning commission is so in favor of the project we ought to have it in to discuss the project and invite the public," said Fred Yockey, city manager. "I am glad these questions have been asked."

## 2 area Democrats react to pardon

HARRY L. HANDLEY of Westland has been appointed assistant treasurer of H&H Tube and Manufacturing Company, Detroit-based brass and copper tube mill. Formerly employed by City National Bank where he helped institute and manage the check credit department, Handley was also employed by the Associates Discount Corporation and Michigan Bank. He graduated from Wayne State University and holds certificates from the American Institute of Banking.



Two Democratic candidates reacted angrily to President Ford's granting a pardon to former President Richard Nixon.

U.S. Rep. William D. Ford, seeking re-election in the 15th Congressional District, called the pardon "an outrageous act which completely subverts our judicial system."

Ford used some of his strongest political language to denounce the pardon: "A mockery of our system of equal justice... especially repugnant in view of the fact that so many of Mr. Nixon's former subordinates are being subjected to prosecution and punishment... a frightening example for the future."

But Ford, whose district includes Westland, Garden City, Canton Township and a corner of Livonia, hesitated at questioning the president's motives. He called the president's ac-

tion the result of "either a spirit of misguided compassion, ill-considered friendship, or in response to pure partisan politics by Republicans anxious to sweep the entire Watergate mess under the rug."

John Reuther, locked in a recount battle for the Democratic nomination in the 2nd Congressional District, called the pardon "an affront to the American system of justice."

"President Ford has demonstrated what was made clear by the Agnew case — that there are two standards of justice in this country, one for the rich and powerful and another for the average citizen."

Reuther saw "one bright spot in this whole affair... the resignation of J.F. terHorst, Presidential press secretary. He has demonstrated the commitment to principle that we should expect from our public servants."

# New administrator selected for Wayne County Hospital

Samuel H. Smith has been appointed director of Wayne County General Hospital.

Smith assumes the position after more than six years as executive director of the Morrisania City Hospital in the Bronx and a career spanning 22 years in hospital administration.

N. Frank Cylkowski, chairman of the Board of County Institutions, says Smith is known as "an outstanding administrator with great concern for patient needs, plus fresh ideas and the ability to inspire a hospital staff with his vision and leadership."

A search committee of 11 professionals and county officials helped narrow the field of 38 applicants to three

finalists. The Board of Institutions made the final choice.

IN HIS NEW post, Smith will direct the operation of a 424-bed acute hospital, a 24-bed long-term care facility, plus out-patient and emergency departments that serve the county population of almost 2.7 million, with a total budget of about \$40 million.

The Wayne County General Hospital is on a 360-acre site at Michigan Avenue and Merriman in the City of Westland.

Smith reports to the Board of Institutions which consists of five elected officials—three county commission-

ers and two county auditors.

Besides Cylkowski (D-Detroit), the board consists of commissioners Tom F. Taylor (D-Westland) and Samuel A. Turner (D-Detroit), and auditors Leonard D. Proctor and Arthur A. Sumeracki.

Cylkowski noted that Smith is the first non-physician to be the top administrator at Wayne County General. He said the post of executive director was established as part of the modernization of the hospital administrative structure, begun last year by the County Board of Commissioners.

Most hospitals now have lay administrators to handle the non-medical aspects of their operations, Cylkowski said.

"Filling of this new position is in keeping with the avowed goal of the county commissioners, the county auditors and the new Board of Institutions to provide the residents of Wayne County with the finest public hospital in the nation," Cylkowski stated.

DR. H. J. WELLS, the last medical superintendent, became director of the hospital's new Walter P. Reuther extended care and rehabilitation facility when it opened earlier this year.

Cylkowski said that while at Morrisania, Smith successfully reorganized administrative practices and expanded facilities, particularly for ambulatory (out-patient) patients.

Cylkowski noted that a hospital task force established by the board of commissioners has recommended, among other measures, a massive expansion of out-patient services of Wayne County General.

Smith, 52, was director of a state narcotics rehabilitation center in New York City before taking the Morrisania post. Before that, he coordinated state health department inspection of hospitals and nursing homes in seven New York counties, and earlier served as assistant administrator of the 1400-bed Bronx Municipal Hospital Center.

Smith holds a masters degree in hospital administration from Washington University in St. Louis where he also earned a bachelors degree in business and finance.

A native of Port Tampa, Fla., Smith began his career as principal assistant administrator at Homer G. Phillips Hospital in St. Louis, Mo., 22 years ago. Smith is a veteran of World War II.

Smith said he was assuming his new post with "great optimism" because "The Wayne County Commissioners and the Board of Institutions clearly intend to maintain this hospital as one of the finest health care facilities in the United States."

THE BOARD of commissioners involved itself directly in the hospital operation after the hospital briefly lost its national accreditation last year. The accreditation was restored within six months as the result of improvements in record keeping, administration and staffing patterns.

Outside consultants and a hospital task force were given the task of evaluating the hospital operation. Creation of the executive director's position was among the actions that resulted.

Five appointed citizens serving on the Board of Institutions were replaced by three County Commissioners and two County Auditors.

The Board of Institutions acts as liaison with the human resources com-

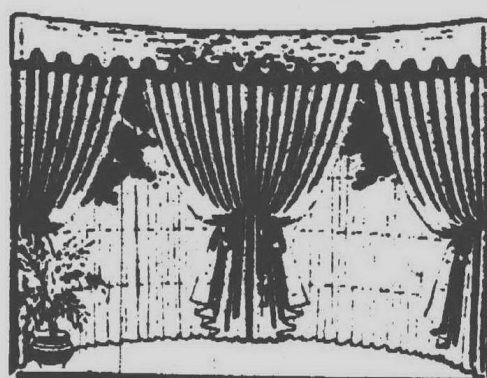
mittee of the board of commissioners. Taylor is the chairman and Cylkowski vice-chairman of the human resources committee.

Other Human Resources Committee members are: Mary E. Duman (R-Livonia); Catherine Shavers (D-Detroit); William G. Suzore (D-Lincoln Park); and Robert D. Mahoney (D-Detroit).

The executive director search committee consisted of three medical doctors, two hospital administrators, commissioners Cylkowski, Taylor and Suzore, plus County Board Chairman Robert E. FitzPatrick (D-Detroit), and two county staff officials.

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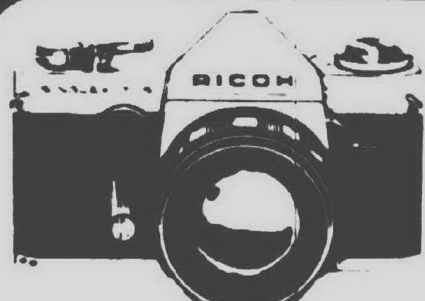
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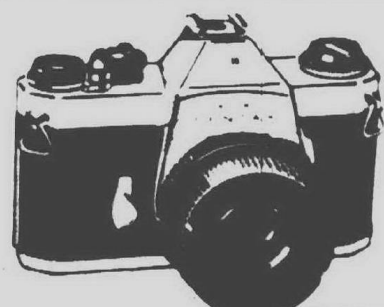
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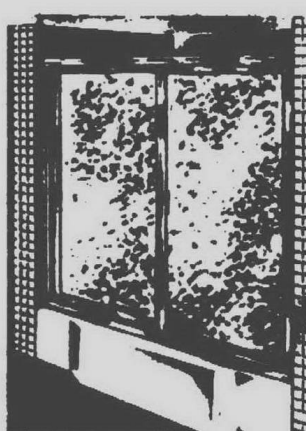
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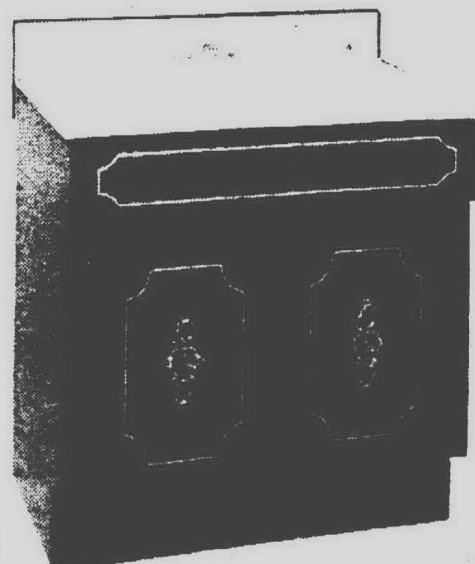
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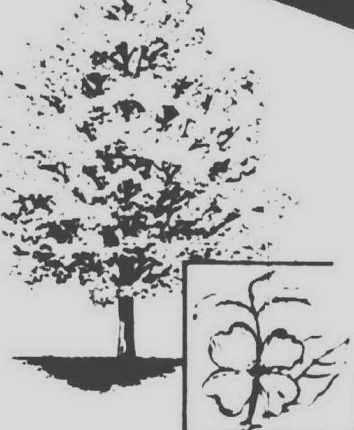
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# It's good to see Ford-Congress honeymoon end

The words were simple, majestic and to the point:

"Now, therefore, I Gerald Ford, president of the United States, pursuant to the pardon power conferred upon me by Article II, Section 2, of the Constitution, have granted and by these presents do grant a full, free, and absolute pardon unto Richard Nixon for all offenses against the United States which he, Richard Nixon, has committed or may have committed or taken part in during the period from Jan. 20, 1969, through Aug. 9, 1974."

Equally noble was President Ford's objective: to finally put an end to Watergate.

Regrettably, his decision was a mistake. Ending the country's preoccupation with Watergate will quite clearly not be achieved. Because the judicial process of investigation and examination of the evidence, followed by the fact-determining process of a trial, have been short-circuited by the pardon before they really got under way, there will be a surge of public interest in what Mr. Nixon really said and did about Watergate.

The simple frustration of public curiosity—coupled with reports of indictable offenses—en-

force continuing media interest in the still-murky events and motivations behind Watergate, which is likely to last at least as long as any trial proceedings involving Mr. Nixon.

THERE IS a further curious element in Mr. Nixon's pardon as a way to end Watergate.

How can you pardon someone if you don't know in respect to what precise criminal offense he is being pardoned?

This question becomes particularly important when evaluated in the context of Mr. Nixon's obviously negotiated statement following the pardon, which admitted "mistakes" and "misjudgments" but carefully stopped short of any admission of a crime.

It is quite well established that the constitutional purposes for the presidential power to pardon were to provide a court of last resort against a gross and aberrant distortion of justice that might be rendered in a decision by the judicial branch of government. No constitutional precedent justifies a pardon to put an end to national attention to a scandal or, indeed, to grant mercy to a criminal convicted by due process.

My opinion is that President Ford committed an act with both counterproductive and illogical consequences because, genuinely moved by reports of Mr. Nixon's deteriorating health and emotional condition, he allowed his instincts for mercy to outweigh his more proper duty to make sure that the processes of equal justice for all men under the law be fully followed.

In short, the decision was a mistake. And it would be terrible, indeed, if President Ford were now to grant pardon to all others involved in Watergate, on the argument that it would be inconsistent to pardon only Mr. Nixon.

One mistake is enough; let's not use it to justify a brazen, absurd cover-up of the cover-up.

SOMETHING USEFUL, however, does come from what otherwise is a sad situation.

President Ford's decision to pardon Mr. Nixon savagely and suddenly ends the honeymoon that has existed between the new president and the media and the American people for the past month.

The media, terrified by the sudden Freudian realization of guilt that it had killed the primal father by driving him from office, has been bending over backwards to give the new president good notices—the point of stretching ordinary common sense.

Whenever national columnists are driven to spasms of admiration at revelations that a president likes a swim before dinner, intends to sleep in the same bed with his wife, and appears in a bathrobe on the front lawn to pick up the morning paper, we can be sure something absurd is going on.

It has been. And since what's needed more than anything about our presidency is a strong dose of realism and common sense, the end to the honeymoon is a long run benefit which cannot be overvalued.

### Public hurt by strikes, negotiation secrecy

Well here we are again, involved in strikes of teachers' unions in five school districts in Wayne County covered by the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers.

But this time there is a slight difference in the feeling of many of the taxpayers. They no longer are taking the teachers under their wings and making scapegoats of the school boards. Still vivid in the minds of many parents are the two-week walkout of Livonia teachers last fall and the situation in Detroit.

During the past summer Detroit pupils had to attend classes until mid-July because of a strike that halted sessions for several weeks.

Michigan laws state that a school district must have a set number of school days to qualify for state aid, thus Detroit had to keep the pupils going until mid-summer.

AND YOU CAN BET your last dollar it didn't set well with parents anywhere within the Detroit city limits. They had only a short time of about six weeks to make plans for summer vacations and the kids had hardly started the recess until they were back in school again.

Perhaps for some mothers of large families the short vacation was welcome. She didn't have her brood underfoot long enough to cause her any trouble.

But now the situation is a bit different because five teachers' unions are striking in our own backyards and it is our youngsters who are awaiting the end of the negotiations and a return to classes.

All of which brings something to the attention of all taxpayers involved. In the negotiations this year, it appears as if neither the school board nor the teachers want the public to know what is going on.

It isn't that all have declared blackouts on news but none of the parties involved seems very anxious to let news of the talks leak out.

### Sense And Nonsense

What should teachers do with their spare time when they're on strike? A woman had an answer for teachers in the Wayne-Westland District.

She suggested to the school board that teachers could use their spare time to remove political signs from trees and utility poles that were put up during last June's school board campaign by Vincent Petitpren and his supporters.

Petitpren, elected to the board with the help of the now-striking teachers union, had "no comment" to her suggestion.

But later in the meeting, when Petitpren momentarily left the room, another board member, Robert Reichard, asked if Petitpren had left to haul down his signs.

Any respectable womens libber would cringe at the wording of a letter from the Northville Town Hall Series to the Women's Continuum Program at Schoolcraft College.

The letter was in reference to a \$200 gift from the town hall series to help establish a women's resource center at Schoolcraft.

It says "Attention: Nancy Dufour, Gentlemen: It is with great pleasure..."

Leads you to wonder if maybe Bobby Riggs doesn't have a foot in the town hall somewhere.



ESPECIALLY IS THIS true in the Plymouth School District where it appears neither the teachers nor the school board has shown the responsibility and maturity one would expect from two such groups involved in negotiations.

The Plymouth Education Association has taken a stand that it wants nothing to do with the local newspapers. It has closed the doors to meetings that should be open to the public such as sessions where the PEA and members of the school board get together to informally discuss the situation.

"We don't want the press to know what's going on," has been the repeated statement of President Dolly Carter, a rather militant leader who prefers the public know nothing about the negotiations.

This is the same school district that went back to the voters not so long ago for additional millage which was approved. The thanks the taxpayers received was a strike.

BY THE SAME TOKEN members of the Plymouth school board have been guilty of actions that one has never encountered anywhere else.

For example, one board member, who received considerable support from the PEA during the last election, went into a meeting of the teachers on her own volition and made an offer without consulting the other members of the board or the members of the negotiating team.

In another instance the board decided to hold a public hearing against the advice of counsel and then found itself in a big bind when persons in the audience deliberately baited trustees with questions to which they couldn't possibly have answers without a bit of research.

The story isn't quite that sad in other districts but in Garden City the school board president very candidly admitted the trustees knew what was best for the taxpayers and would act accordingly. Maybe so, but the taxpayers are paying the bills and they should be made aware of what they are paying for.

IN WAYNE-WESTLAND and South Redford school districts, every effort is made to keep the press and thus the voters informed of the progress of negotiations.

There is an agreement between the teachers' unions and the school boards to let people in on the talks. Thus there has been no problem in either community of keeping up with the times.

But Plymouth, well that's something else. It seems that the public shouldn't know; what takes place at the negotiation tables is a deep secret.

Of course it's hard to keep a secret of a strike when teachers are picketing the board, students are picketing the teachers and parents are also marching in front of the union meetings.

THE STRIKE is going to be settled and probably soon. But each strike weakens the effectiveness of the teachers in the classroom and in the community. They aren't looked up to like gods and goddesses as they were a few years back.

It takes a long time for the sting of a strike to leave a community... it takes that much longer when revered folks, such as teachers, decide to act like ordinary individuals. You'd be surprised how quickly youngsters pick up this feeling.

If I understand this correctly, it means that the longer a man remains in public office, the less responsive he is to the rank and file voter of his constituency.

It is easy to criticize, but then one has the obligation of offering a solution. To me, it is quite obvious that terms of office should be lengthened so that a person is not always campaigning.

WE ALL KNOW, when we are elected chairman of a committee or president of an organization, that we do great things in the first term but have a tendency to taper off when we are reelected to a second term. There is no reason to believe this is not true in government.

community an apology," another parent said. "We don't need a militant teachers' union threatening this community with a strike."

"Teachers need a living wage and we've shown that we're willing to pay for it. Now what's going on here? As a brother union member, I say you're wrong. We owe you a decent wage, but we don't need a Mary Ellen Riordan in this community."

"I'm glad we didn't start teaching in July and end up negotiating now," said Karen Chapin, a teacher at Miller School, where the "45-15" year-round school project was to have started this year.

"We've been bargaining since April and have gotten nowhere," said Jessie Hudson, a teacher at Plymouth-Salem High School.

SCHOOL BUS DRIVER Loretta Olson noted that the transportation employees' old contract expired July 1. "We settled it later this summer," she said, "but the buses kept running. I've always considered the negotiating team of the board easy to get along with."

One resident who supported the teachers said that in recent years administrators have been receiving a growing share of the district's payroll.

McClendon cited figures which showed administrators received 7.9

per cent of all salaries paid in the district in 1972-73, the peak in recent years, but last year received 7.6 per cent and according to current budget estimates will earn about 7.1 per cent of the total this year.

"It's time the board and the PEA get together in a locked room," said one high school student. "Let them eat cold hamburgers."

Negotiators for both sides have raised the possibility that a settlement might be reached on a first-year contract, with negotiations continuing on the second year while the teachers returned to work.

"We are not stonewalls," a biology instructor said. "If it's close on a first year, we'll go back if a neutral third party comes in while we teach."

"I don't believe it's in the best interest of the community to separate the two years," said board member Yack. "Both years are tied together...the community deserves two years of labor peace."

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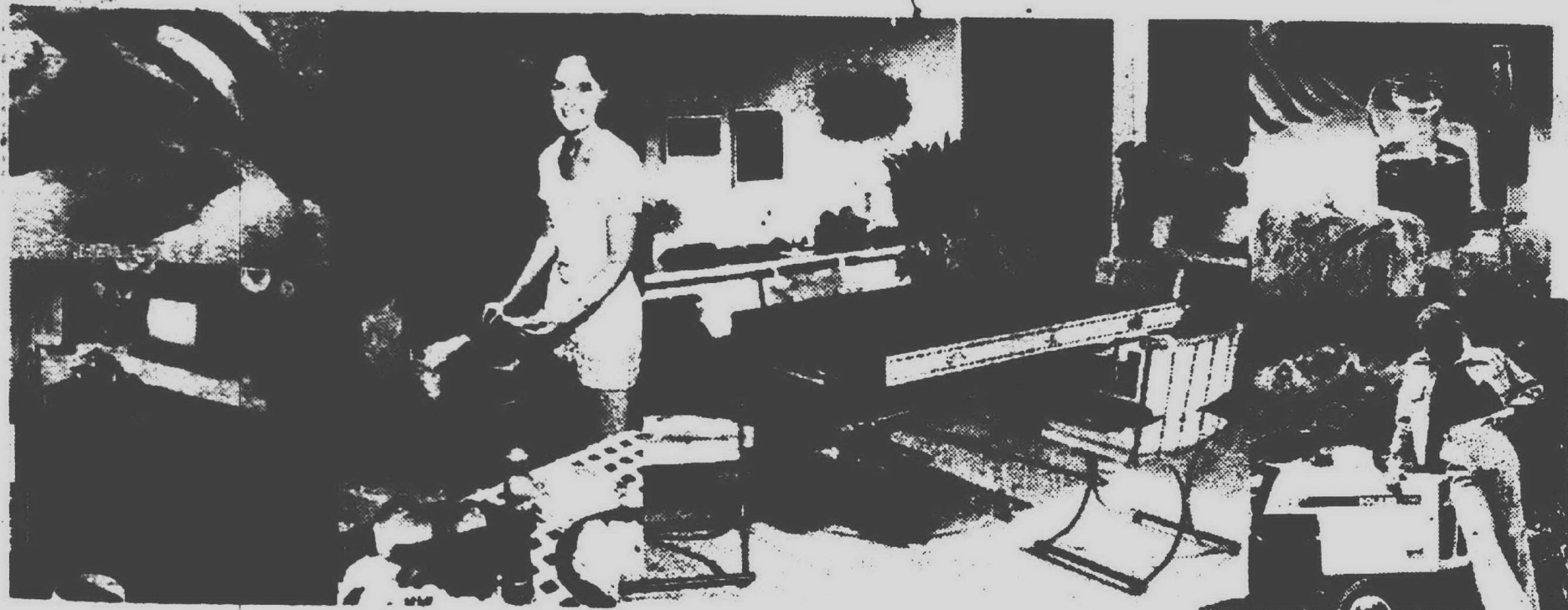

## Cooperative buying It's a way some families beat rising costs

BY MARGARET MILLER

If rising prices are squeezing your family out of needed purchases, you might want to look into cooperative buying.

It's a way that some 3,800 families in the metropolitan area are saving some of their dollars and putting the rest to maximum use.

They are members of the Detroit Consumers Association, headquartered in Livonia and operating to pool the purchasing power of families all over the area.

The organization, as manager Jerry Amster reports, started with steaks and now involves purchasing of close to a hundred items that run the alphabetical gamut from Air conditioners to Wallpaper.

**FAMILIES THAT JOIN** pay a membership fee. It covers costs of operating the office where Amster, office manager Lynn Wilson and a part-time student assistant handle the business of buying.

Purchases are made through firms that have agreed to give a discount price. Sample reports from participants indicate they have priced the items sought and indeed have found a better deal through Consumers merchants.

A \$350 saving on a new compact station wagon was mentioned by one new member.

**AMSTER WENT BACK** into the history of the association.

It was 1965, he remembered, that he and a group of friends were doing what they did often—complaining about high prices.

"Of course we were all positive then," he said, "that the cost of living couldn't possibly get any higher than it was in 1965."

While the discussion went on, he said, "one fellow who was in the restaurant business said he could buy us steak at the Eastern Market if we would all put up a certain amount of money to buy in quantity."

The result of that conversation was that 12 families contributed \$125 each and the restaurateur purchased \$1,500 worth of prime steak at wholesale prices. Everybody had a lot of good eating.

**"THE STEAK ORDER** led to other things," Amster said. "We found we could get better prices by buying in quantity."

Organization of the association, which started in a Garden City office and now looks over Livonia from the top floor of a new mid-rise, has

been modeled on the cooperatives that sprung up in California in the '60s.

"Our idea," Amster said, "is that for families of middle and upper middle income, there must be a better way of buying things than spending a great deal of time shopping and then having to pay a great many middlemen."

"We have professionals to do the shopping, and buying direct from the wholesale supplier has minimized handling enough to substantially reduce costs. And the quality is consistently higher."

**THE DETROIT CONSUMER** Association has expanded its membership from 12 to 3,800 largely through word-of-mouth.

"Each family that joins gives us a list of friends who might be interested," the manager said. "Then, working in the different areas of the metropolitan area, we call on prospects and explain to them what we can offer and what their responsibilities would be."

"We can enroll a maximum of 10 new families each week."

Recently-enrolled members have reported that one impressive feature in the visit was the lack of pressure.

"We're inclined to be apprehensive of come-on offers," said Mrs. Leslie Zalewski of Farmington, "but in this there was no push at all."

**AFTER A NEW MEMBER** is signed up, Amster said, the association accepts responsibility for purchasing for him.

Members make purchases through the association by deciding on the item that interests them and telephoning its description, complete with model number, to the association office. The member also quotes the best price he has been offered.

"Then we get the best price we can through the distributors we work with," Amster said. "Usually there's quite a difference."

Large assortments of household and transportation equipment are included in the list of items available.

In other areas of purchasing, many members participate in a freezer and meat plan and children's shoes are obtained through the cooperative.

**"WE'VE BEEN VERY PLEASED** with our freezer and we buy a lot of meat and other frozen foods through the association," said Mrs. Marti Rozmys of Westland. "You can get meats in the

quantity you want and you call for a new order when you are ready."

Mrs. Rozmys said she and her husband, Dan, also had used their membership often during the last few years to buy gifts for weddings and graduations.

**THE STATION WAGON** purchased by Leslie Zalewski, Farmington special education director who also is beginning a private marriage counseling business, bore a price tag \$350 less than the best price he had been able to obtain.

"Someone had given our name to the association just before we planned to buy a car," Mrs. Zalewski said, "so after we checked it out with the Better Business Bureau that was our first big purchase."

"We definitely were impressed."

**ALSO QUITE NEW MEMBERS** are Michael Labriola and his wife, Roberta, of Birmingham.

"We figure we saved at least \$35 on the freezer we bought, and the meat we have purchased also is quite a saving," Mrs. Labriola said. "We also bought an electric teakettle and figure the price we paid was about two-thirds of retail."

"My husband now is planning to get new glasses through the cooperative, and I need new luggage and some bedspreads."

**ROBERT AND SARAH WARREN** of Garden

City are remodeling their kitchen, so they are checking prices of appliances they'll be purchasing through the association.

"We bought a fence that way, too, and some really good bedroom furniture," Mrs. Warren said. "We also buy meat for our freezer and I always buy the children's shoes through the association."

"We insist on getting good shoes, and doing it this way we find they don't cost quite so much."

**THE MATTER OF QUALITY** is an important part of the cooperative association, Amster agreed.

"The main advantage is that we know we are getting our money's worth," he said. "We aren't looking for something for nothing, so we can take competitive bids to get the best deal possible for our members faced with today's high prices."

The association, Amster said, also tries to offer tips on buying not done through the cooperative.

"We recommend that people look for the loss leader items at the grocery stores and buy them in the largest quantity permitted," he added.

Starting with steaks, spreading to many other products, adding services by members at reduced rates and even including things like vacation trips at reduced rates, the Detroit Consumers Association tries to put a dent in high living costs.

As Amster puts it, "We're converting bargaining power into buying power."

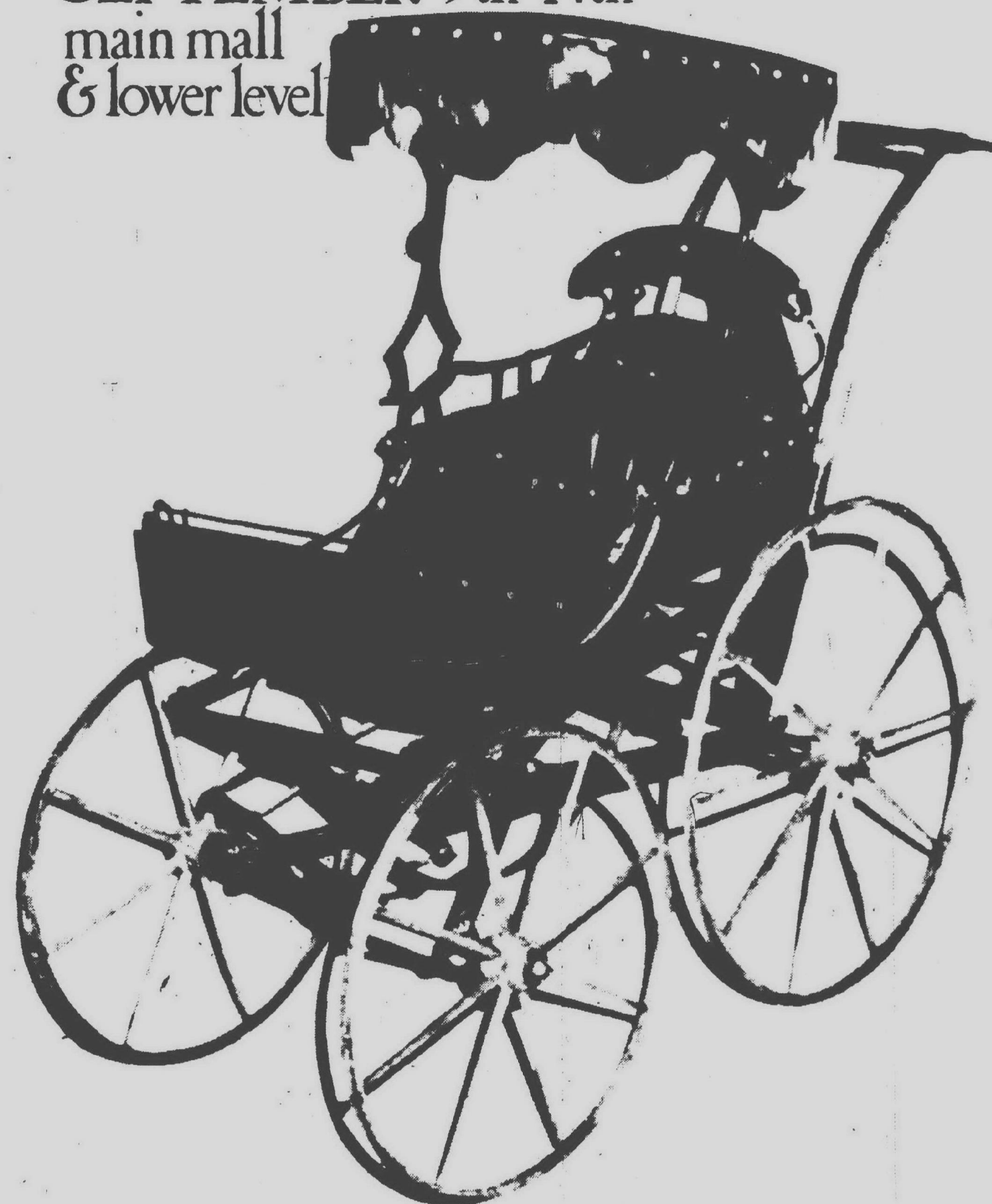

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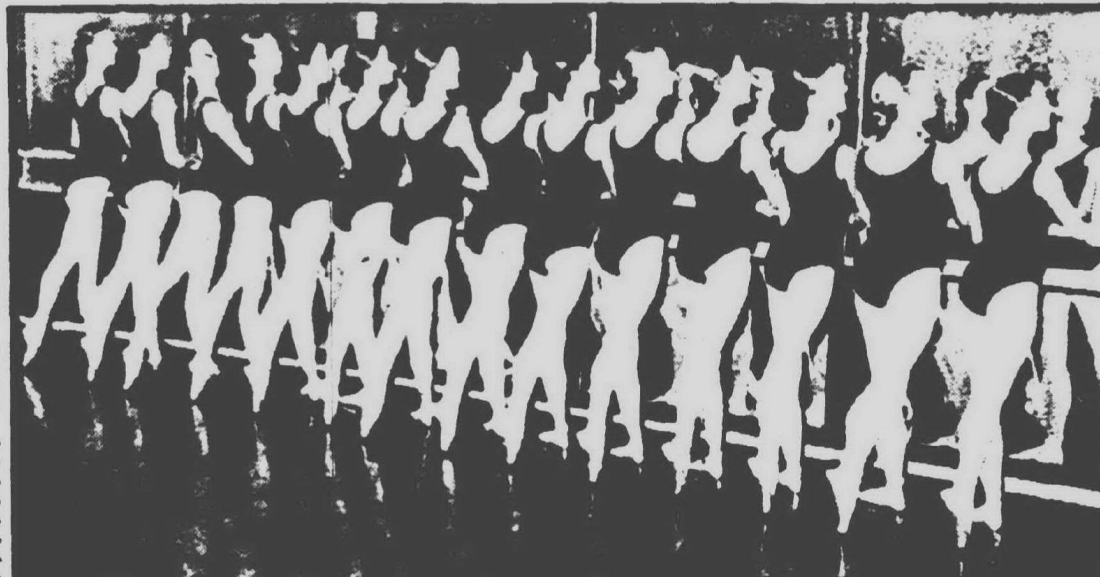
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# Circuit-riders return for Heritage Sunday

The circuit-riding preacher (or a couple of reasonable facsimiles) will return to Livonia as Newburgh United Methodist Church celebrates its Heritage Sunday Sept. 15.

Looking back to its beginnings nearly a century and a half ago, the congregation will gather on the front lawn of the present church home at 36500 Ann Arbor Trail for services at 9:15 and 11 a.m.

There members will greet their "traveling preachers," the Rev. William A. Ritter and the Rev. Duane Snyder, as they arrive on horseback as did an itinerant clergyman named George Hickox as far back as 1826.

After some appropriate hymn-singing outside to begin each of the two morning services, the congregation and riders will adjourn to the sanctuary to complete celebrations of the early days of one of the oldest churches in western Wayne County.

HERITAGE SUNDAY started out as a commemoration of the founding of the Methodist church in the area 140 years ago, said Rev. Ritter, pastor of Newburgh.

But as research for the occasion got under way, information turned up indicating that circuit-riding preacher Hickox had been coming through the area for "class meetings" as early as 1826.

So that makes this our 148th birthday," the minister said.

The first formal congregation was established in 1834, he said, meeting in the schoolhouse with the Rev. Marcus Swift leading worship. Rev. Ritter said.

In 1846 the first church home was built, located on the east side of Newburgh Road across from the building that used to be the Newburgh school.

A Congregational church was built down the street and next to the cemetery in 1848, Rev. Ritter continued, and a few years later the two denomi-

nations decided to merge, using the Congregational building as sanctuary and turning the Methodist building over to the Ladies Aid Society.

"IT WAS IN 1915," she said, "that the congregation decided it might attract more members in a better location, so the building was literally rolled down Ann Arbor to the corner site on the northeast corner of Newburgh and Ann Arbor Trail, where it still stands.

"In 1920 a crisis occurred. The Newburgh church was served by the pastor of the Plymouth Methodist Church. He came to this rural area Sunday afternoons, and liked the arrangement because he could go home laden with farm produce.

"But a wealthy member of the Plymouth church objected to the double duty and decided to pay the minister the amount he was making to serve Newburgh."

The congregation dealt with that blow by filling in with student ministers until it could raise funds to build a parsonage and attract a full-time minister.

WHEN LIVONIA BECAME a city, its building inspectors ruled the old churchhouse unsafe for public meetings, so the congregation moved into the church hall it had built next door, Rev. Ritter said.

About that time, he added, the late Donald Ryder was instrumental in obtaining the land from the estate of Emma Arnold for construction of the present sanctuary, dedicated in 1962, and educational unit, completed in 1971.

The congregation now numbers 1,250 members.

THE SERVICES SUNDAY will include skits portraying personalities of Newburgh's past, including pastors Hickox and Swift and early members Josiah Smith and George Ryder.

A COMMITTEE of Newburgh members including Larry Johnson, Gladys Ryder, Linda Pate, Winnie Nixon and

Melanie Parrish has been in charge of writing the skits.

The commemorative activities were planned for several reasons, the pastor said.

"First, Newburgh is located in the section of Livonia literally rich in history," he explained, "and we have in our congregation descendants of several of the old families."

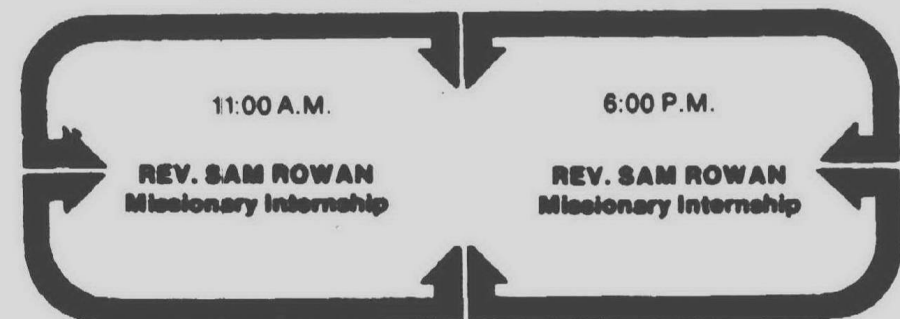

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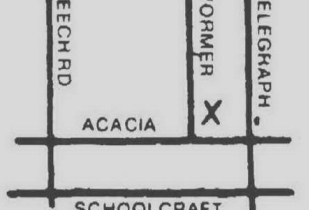

# How to combat crime topic at area hearing on Sept. 18

Wayne County residents will have a chance to express their ideas on law enforcement Wednesday, Sept. 18, in the City County Building auditorium, Detroit.

The hearing will be conducted by the Michigan Commission on Criminal Justice which has been studying problems of too much crime, uneven justice and the fragmented criminal justice response.

The commission now believes it has found some solutions — ones that promise to reduce crime, assure equal protection of the rights of victims and the accused, and increase the efficiency, effectiveness and productivity of all workers in the criminal justice system.

**PURPOSE OF** the hearing is to give the public a chance to react to the proposed goals and standards drafted by the commission during the past year. Goals and standards will be outlined during the hearing.

Among those who will testify is County Commissioner Roscoe L. Bobo, executive chairman of the Detroit-Wayne County Criminal Justice System Coordinating Council.

Bobo, retired assistant police chief of Ecorse, says: "The commission has assured us that all ideas put forth at this hearing will be considered."

"Crime has an impact on every citizen. This hearing gives the citizen an opportunity to make an impact on crime by contributing his ideas on priorities and needs."

Persons wishing to testify are asked to inform the Office of Criminal Justice Programs by letter as to where they intend to appear and about what time. The address is Second Floor, Lewis Cass Building, Lansing 48913, attention: Gail R. Light.

All testimony will be limited to five minutes, with written testimony preferred.

Simultaneous hearings will be held in the Rackham Building, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, and in the County Building, Oakland County, in Pontiac, and five other locations in Michigan.

**JAMES H. BRICKLEY**, lieutenant governor and chairman of the state advisory group, says the proposed solutions were prepared in response to a recognized need for comprehensive planning, clear state and local policies, and a set of guidelines to fight crime.

"We believe the criminal justice system in Michigan can do better and, therefore, play a leading role in crime reduction."

"The goals and standards, drafted by this commission, can, if adopted, improve and modernize criminal justice services. They can modernize techniques and prioritize activities."

"These improvements alone, however, may not be sufficient to reduce crime. The basic weapons of crime control are in the minds and hearts of our people and in all their social, economic and physical systems."

Brickley added that results of the hearings will be incorporated in the document which is scheduled to be approved Sept. 30. Later this year, the final set of goals and standards will be presented to the governor for consideration.

Brickley explained that the commission worked with the knowledge that the criminal justice system "cannot alone prevent crime."

"This responsibility is shared by the family peer groups, school, churches, recreational and service organizations, health and mental systems and the entire complex manpower development and employment system."

"Prevailing social values and respect for law and law enforcement will also be important. Thus, we urge caution in expecting automatic suc-

cess if society supports what we recommend. We can improve the system of criminal justice, but only a total social effort can cut many roots of crime."

**AMONG THE** proposed goals and standards expected to attract the most attention because of their departure from current Michigan practices are:

Juveniles shouldn't be detained in jail under any circumstances;

Each trial court of general jurisdiction should have a family court division;

The juvenile alleged to be a delinquent should be given all the rights given an adult defendant, including trial by jury;

Eliminate the bail bondsman; Compensate inmates at the prevailing local rate for all work performed that is of benefit to the other public or private entities;

Eliminate plea bargaining as soon as the Legislature provides enough resources to ensure that the impact from the rise in criminal litigation can be absorbed without danger to the overall quality of criminal justice; Until plea bargaining is eliminated, bargaining between prosecutors and defendants should be permitted only under a procedure with specific safeguards;

Eliminate delay between arrest and trial to no longer than 60 days for felonies and no longer than 30 days for misdemeanors;

Law enforcement agencies should

make college educated applicants one of the primary targets for all recruitment efforts;

Residency should be eliminated as a pre-employment requirement for law enforcement officers;

Access to school records by criminal justice agencies should be established by law;

Appellate judges should be appointed by the governor with a periodic retention vote taken to ensure public participation;

There should be establishment of a single statewide system of corrections administered and financed by the state; and,

Courts must fix minimum prison sentences up to one-third of the maximum penalty set by the Legislature.

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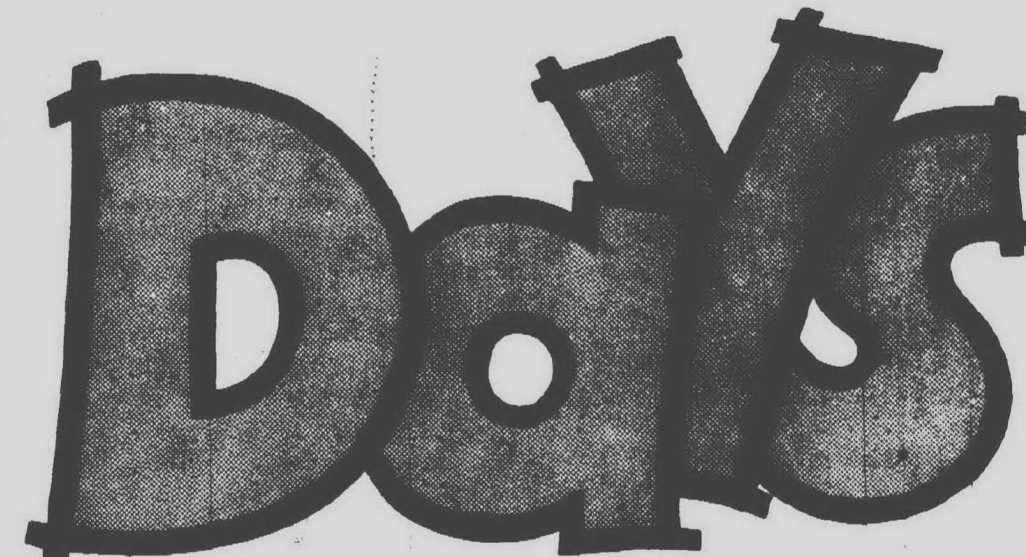

Snapping the ball back to either

Poole or Hare will be 5-foot-10 155 pound senior Garth McGrath. The remaining line is all juniors. At guard will be 5-foot-11 and 170 pound Steve Pniwski with 5-foot-10 and 190 pounder Jeff Rutter on the other side. The tackle berths will be handled by Matt Shinsky at 5-foot-9 and 160 pounds and Tom Burton at 5-foot-11 and 170 pounds.

Junior Bob Samples (5-foot-7 and 138 pounds) and senior Jay Gooch at 6-foot-4 and 208 pounds will be the ends.

Heading up the defense is nose-guard Larry Downey, a 5-foot-7 and 170 pound senior, flanked by two seniors in tackles Greg Stallings (6-foot, 180 pounds) and Ken Storey (6-foot, 175 pounds).

The Tiger defensive ends are Greg Shinsky, a 6-foot-1 and 175 pound soph-

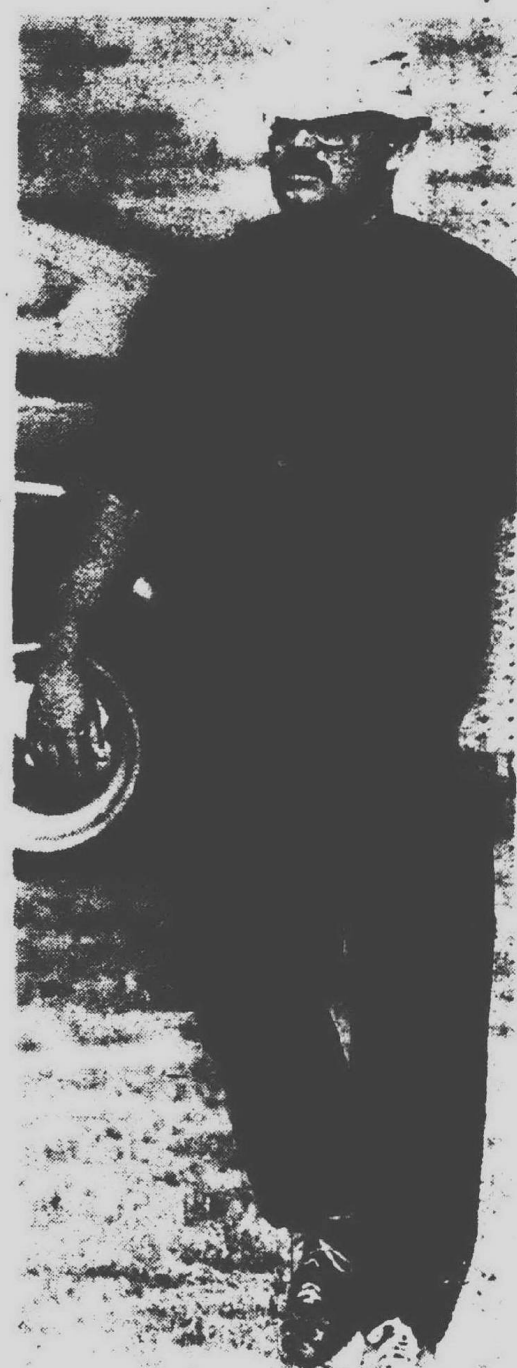
omore, and Mark Gunderson, a 5-foot-11 and 165 pound senior.

The No. 1 man in the lineup will be 6-foot-1, 170 pound senior Jerry Janssens at quarterback. Janssens played about half of the season at quarterback last year when Gary D'Ascenzo was hurt and Riehl is looking for that experience to payoff.

"Jerry is an excellent passer and runner and reads the option well," said the Thurston coach. Backup quarterback will be junior Roy Pilligan at 6-foot and 175 pounds.

At one halfback slot will be junior Gary Abundis. The 5-foot-11 170 pounder carried the ball 50 times as a sophomore and averaged four yards per carry. Another candidate at that position is senior Barry Gragg at 5-foot-11 and 165 pounds.

The heart of the Eagle backfield is fullback Tom Szpond who is ready for year No. 3 on the Thurston varsity squad. The Eagle co-captain with Mitch Drozdowski stands 5-foot-11 and

weighs in at 195 pounds. Drozdowski will also fill in the backfield.

At the center slot is junior John Miller at 6-foot-2 and 185 pounds.

Junior Bob Zichichi, who will be a starter both ways, will be one guard at 6-foot-2 and 257 pounds with senior Greg Harakas the other guard at 6-foot-1 and 255 pounds.

The tackle berth has been nailed down by junior Richard Graustein and senior Brian Buchholz. Graustein, who quarterbacked some last year as a sophomore, checks in at 6-foot-2 and 227 pounds and also was All-Northwest loop linebacker honorable mention.

"We are really high on this Graustein," commented Riehl. "The staff feels that he is ahead of Craig Mutch and Rob Spicer at this stage of the game in potential."

Mutch went on from Thurston to excel at the University of Michigan and Spicer is in the New York Jets organization.

"Graustein is big, strong and mean and if he shows the desire, he is going to be one-heck-of-a football player."

At tight end will be junior Brian Garber at 6-foot-2 and 195 pounds and at split end will be senior Dale Klop-cic at 6-foot-1 and 175 pounds.

The flanker spot has two contenders in senior 5-foot-10, 170 pounder Jeff Krzywada and junior Dennis Kuschell at 5-foot-11 and 170 pounds.

Thurston's offensive line will be checking in at about 220 pounds to be tops in the area in that department.

"Our line is going to be our plus factor," added the Thurston coach. "But the entire right side will be all juniors and it is going to have to show it can do the job."

Zichichi and Harakas will be the tackles on the defensive line with Don Teichman at 5-foot-11 and 170 pounds the nose-guard.

The ends will be junior Jim Konarski at 6-foot-2 and 190 pounds and senior Marty Mosakoski at 6-foot-1 and 185 pounds. Graustein and Szpond are the linebackers with Krzywada, Gragg, and Abundis set for the backfield.

"I guess we could have about eight players going both ways," said Riehl. "But look what Ron Holland did a few years back when he had that many players going both ways — he won a state championship."

Riehl's coaching ranks are rounded out by Ron Lectka, Steve Genyk, Emil Majeski and Bill Mohr.

The Eagles open the '74 season with Churchill this Friday at Churchill, kickoff slated for 4 p.m. and a Northwest "sleeper" could start to awaken.

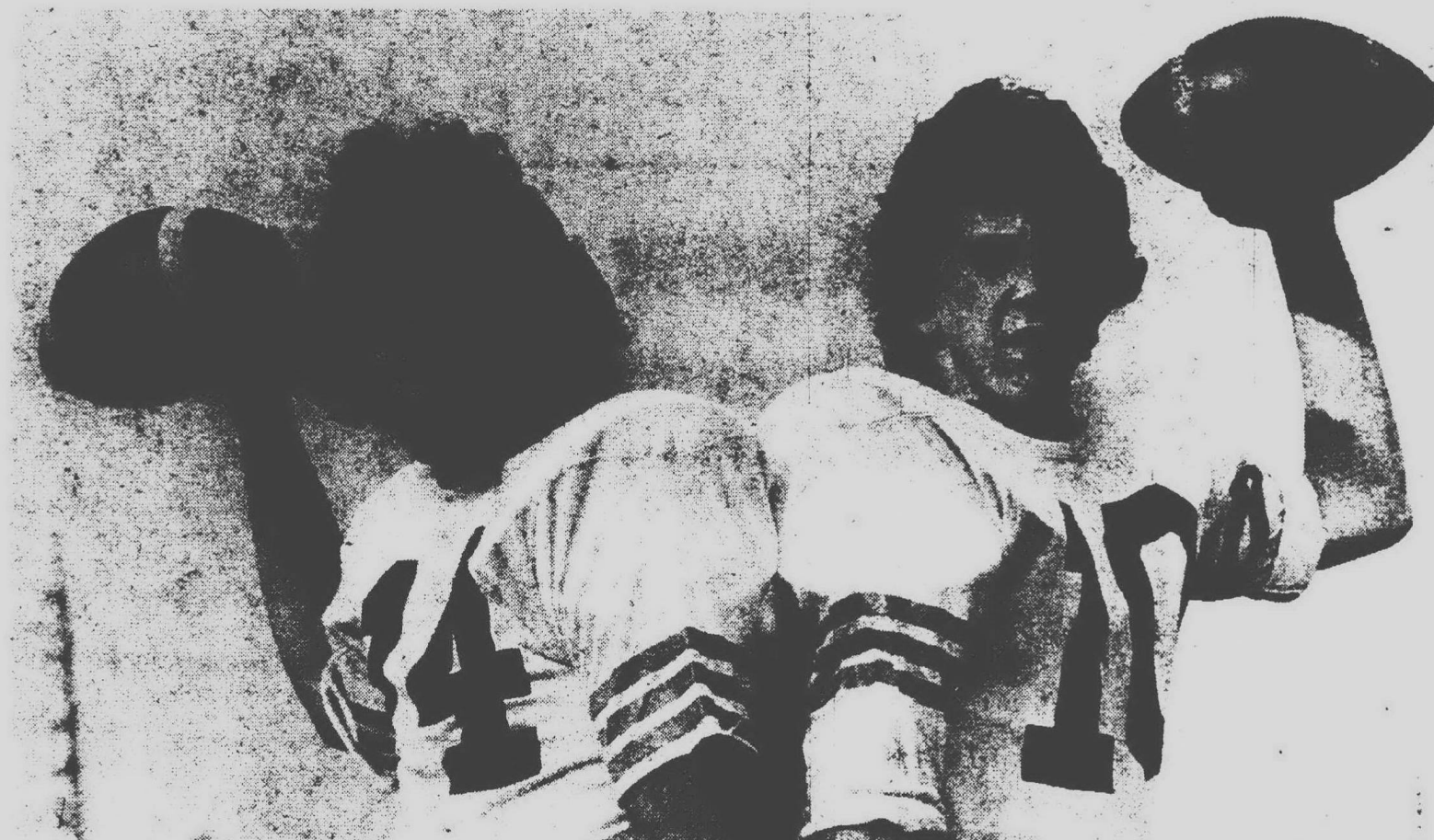

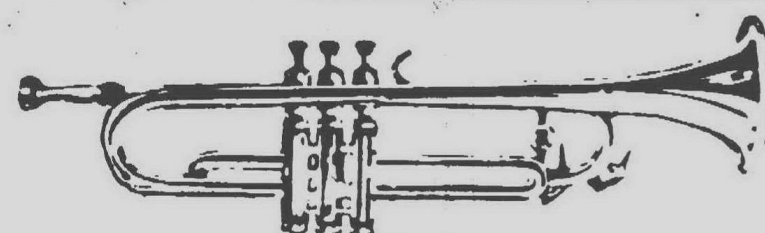

After seven straight victories the Brewers dropped a single game to Mr. F's Beef and Bourbon team, 969 to 959, last Sunday at Oak Park Lanes.

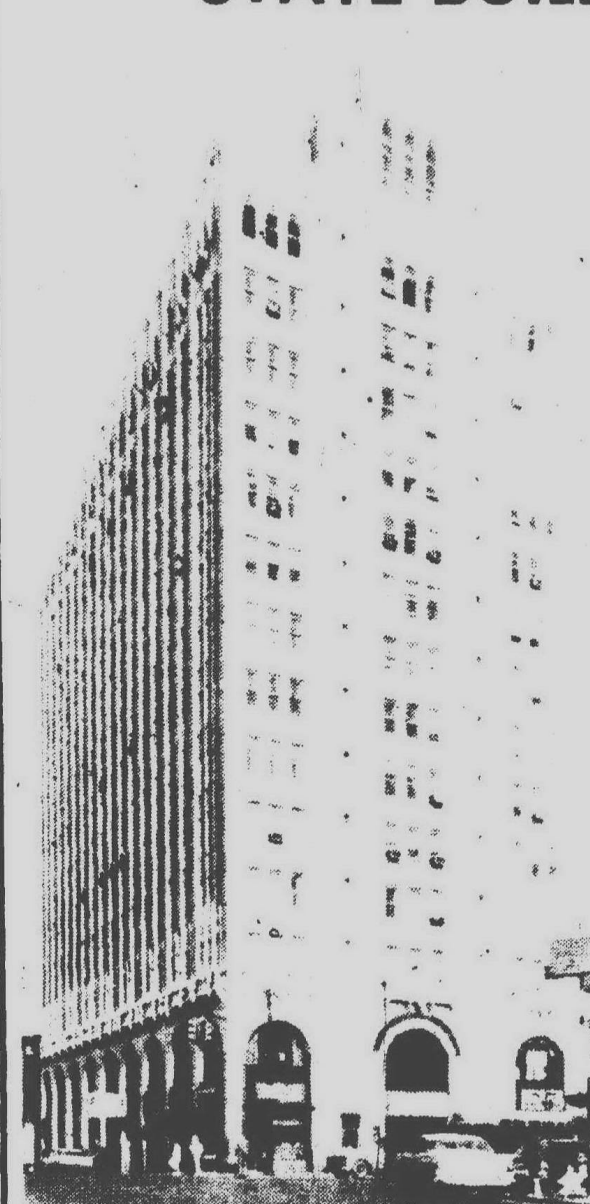
It was the first of the series of Sunday sessions brought about by the

The scoring star of the Sunday session was Fred Mc Clain, of the Edmund team, who fired games of 238, 222 and 192 for a 652.

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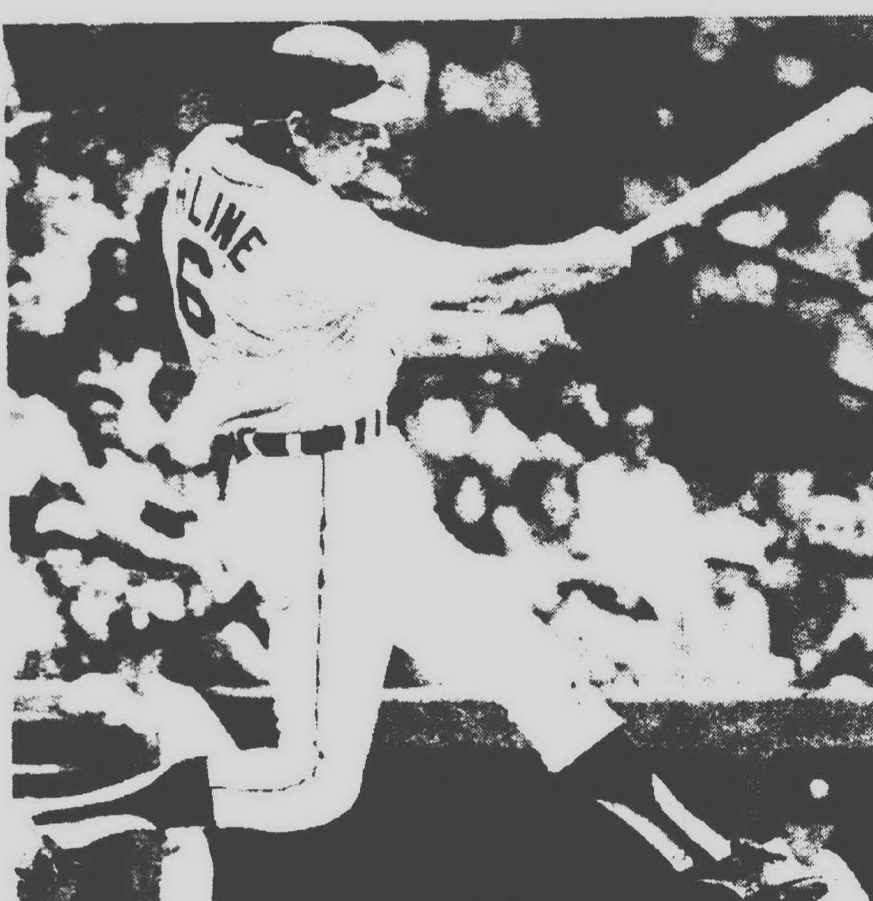

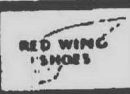
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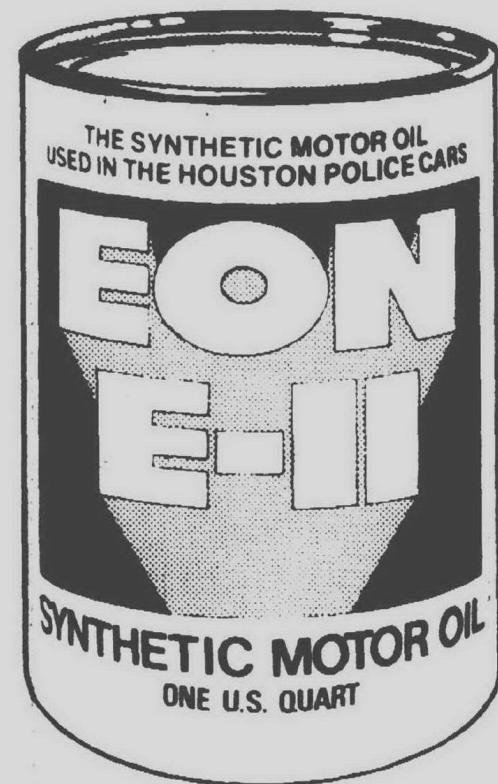
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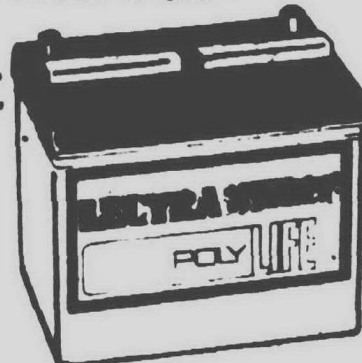
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# The Court Jester



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# Proper brush is important

## Home & Garden

Proper brush use is as important for a good paint job as choosing the right paint and tools. In addition, it assures a long life for your brush and completed paint job. To begin with, be sure that your brush is designed for the job you have in mind. Using a five-inch brush on window sashes will quickly ruin the best brush; not to mention the possibility of spreading paint on the window glass.

**HELP MAKE** painting easier by "priming" the paint brush before use. Dip the brush into the paint halfway to the ferrule (metal part) five or six times. Then tap the brush lightly against the top of the can and it's ready for use.

Continue this tapping procedure each time the brush is dipped in the paint. This shakes off paint drippings and allows you to use both sides of the brush. If you thin out the paint be careful not to overdo it. When painting siding,

use a brush approximately the same width as the boards. Paint the undersides of a section first, then the facing.

**TO PRODUCE** a smoother painted surface, always work from the unpainted section into the previously painted area. To maintain the form and life of your brush, instead of running it sideways when painting small areas, use a smaller brush whenever possible.

# The Green Thumb

By GEORGE ABRAHAM

Two of the toughest insects you have to fight on house plants are white flies and mealybugs.

Actually, the home gardener doesn't have good insecticides to fight these toughies, but don't despair. Right in your own kitchen or bathroom are two good items to kill these bugs. White flies are sucking insects

which congregate on the undersides of the leaves. At temperatures of 85 degrees F. the life cycle is complete in about two weeks, making it tougher to eradicate completely.

Dozens of gardeners are using liquid dishwashing detergent as a contact insecticide at the rate of four teaspoons per gallon of water, using a

one quart plastic trigger sprayer.

Even the low-priced liquid detergents sold in supermarkets under their own brand names are suitable.

**THE DETERGENT KILLS** aphids, certain other bugs, cabbage worms, some thrips, white fly larvae and adults. Some gardeners even claim that the detergent will also control red spider mites.

Dishwater detergent is harmless to humans, and does not injure established plants. It's harmless to pets and wildlife.

To fight mealybugs and scale, a product in your bathroom—hair spray—is useful as a control. As you know, mealy bugs and scale are covered with a waxy coat of armor.

**HAIR SPRAY** directed against these armored insects will get into every nook and cranny, and penetrate the coat of wax.

A greenhouse operator, writing in "Under Glass" magazine writes: "I soak the infected plants with the spray, and it does the trick. I keep a can in the greenhouse always."

And don't forget those cigar and cigarette butts. They make a good bug killer. Soak the butts in water until you get a brown liquid. Pour a little on the soil surface of your house plants and watch how quickly it dispatches springtails, symphyllids, and other underground pests. This juice is good for spraying on aphids also.

**GREEN THUMB CLINIC:** "We have some fruit trees which always grow so tall we can't pick fruit from them. Would it do any harm to cut the tops off? When's the best time?"

Answer: It's perfectly safe to top your fruit trees. In fact, many commercial growers "bob" the tops to make spraying and picking easier.

## Propagate roses

"Late summer or early fall is a good time to propagate roses from cuttings," says William Carlson, extension horticulture specialist at Michigan State University.

"Most varieties of roses can be propagated this way," he notes.

Take summer or soft wood cuttings just after the flowers have fallen, he says. Make six to eight inch cuttings from the stems and remove all the leaves but one or two at the top.

Plant the cuttings with half their length below the ground, water them and put an empty jar upside down

over each cutting. Leave the jar in place all winter.

Take fall or hardwood cuttings after the shoots are very firm. Cut the stems into eight to 10-inch lengths, remove all the leaves and plant the cuttings in a well protected, sunny place with only the top bud above the ground.

Cover the cuttings with several inches of mulch before the first freeze. The mulch should not be removed in the spring until the danger of frost is past.

**RUFFED GROUSE HUNTING REGULATIONS FOR 1974**

The Natural Resources Commission, at its meeting on June 7, 1974, under authority of Secs. 1, 2, 3, and 4, Act 230, P.A. 1925 (pp. 78-80 of Laws Relating to Natural Resources, revision of 1972) took the following action regarding hunting areas, season dates and bag limits for the hunting of ruffed grouse, statewide, for 1974:

1. Rescinded the December closure on ruffed grouse in those portions of Gratiot and Saginaw counties bounded on the north by Highway M-46, on the east by M-52, on the south by M-57, and on the west by U.S. 27.
2. Closed the reduced area in the Gratiot-Saginaw State Game Area as follows: For a period of five years beginning September 1, 1974, no person shall hunt, take, or attempt to take ruffed grouse in December in that part of Gratiot County bounded on the north by Washington Road, on the east by the Gratiot-Saginaw county line, on the south by Highway M-57, and on the west by Highway M-51, and on the west by Ransom Road.

September 15 through November 14; December 1-31.  
Zone 3:  
October 21 through November 14; December 1-31; except in that portion of Gratiot County bounded on the north by Washington Road, on the east by the Gratiot-Saginaw county line, on the south by Highway M-57, and on the west by Ransom Road, where the season will be open from October 21 through November 14 only.

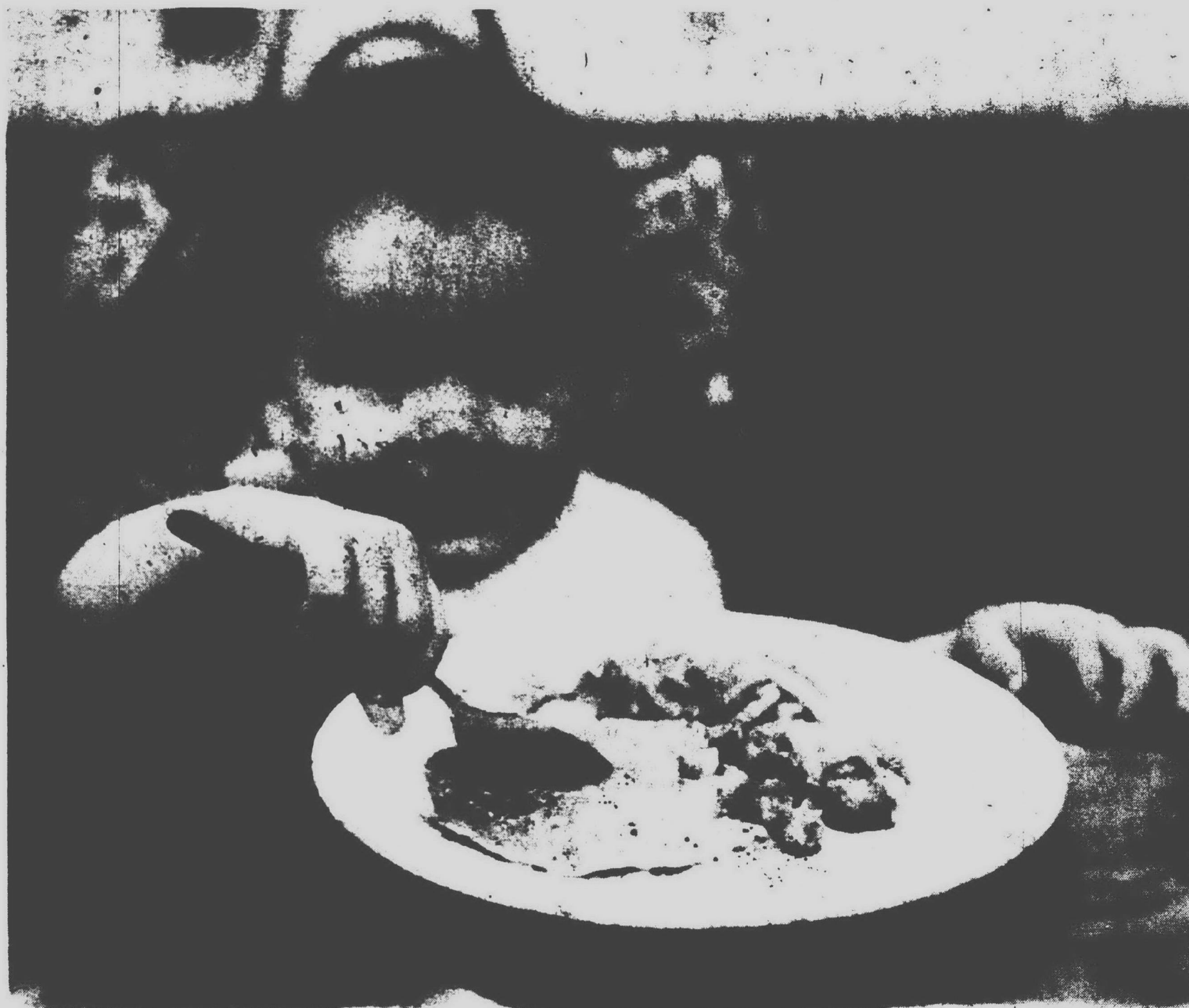
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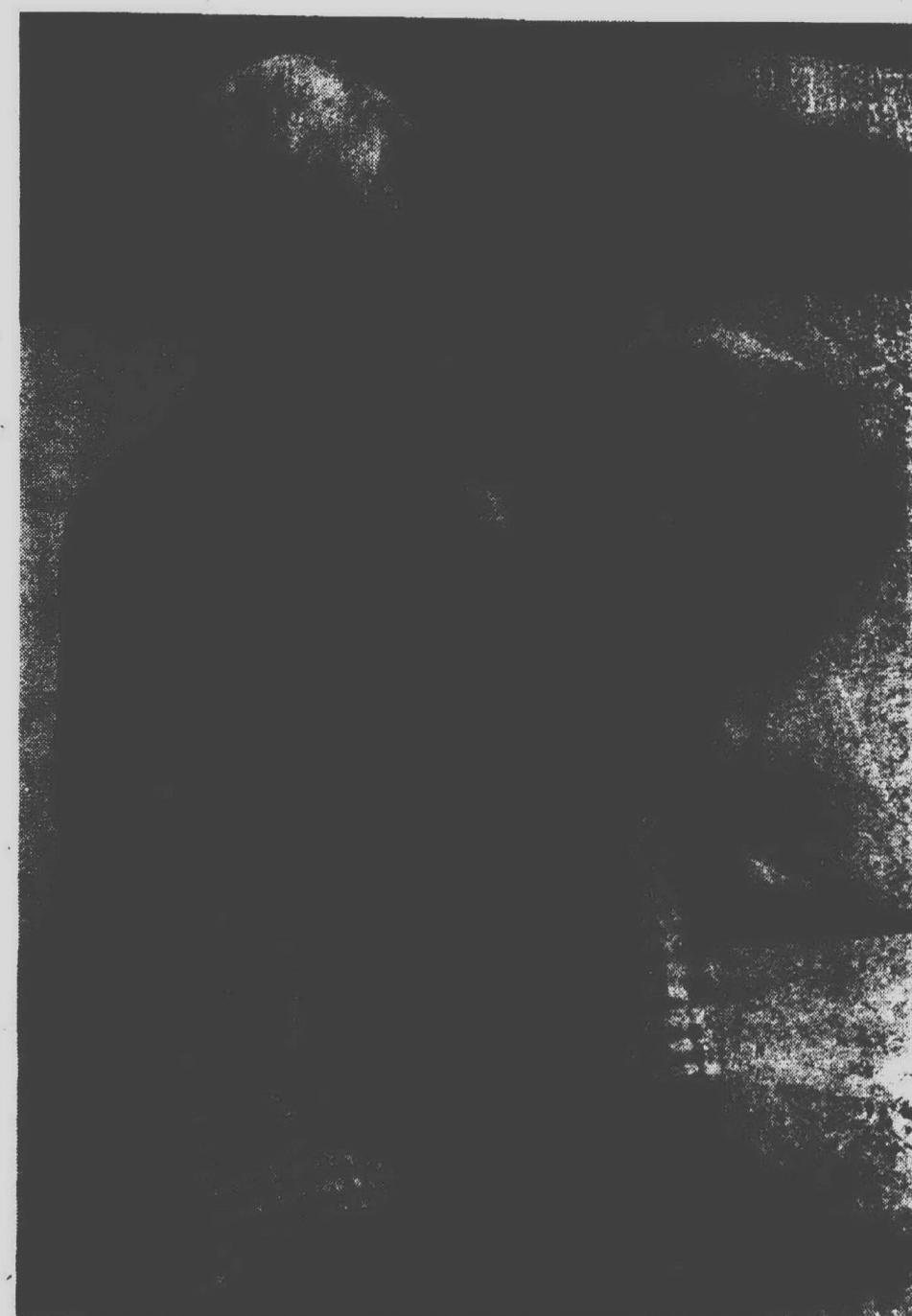

## Retiring as WCCC trustee

John Ryan, the Westland attorney who will retire at the end of year from the board of trustees of Wayne County Community College already has in mind what he plans to do with his spare time.

"I would like to stay in the community college picture," he declared. "I should like to help work out some kind of reasonable arrangement between Henry Ford, Schoolcraft and Wayne County community colleges so that we don't fight over students quite so much."

"It would be a good idea if we didn't waste a lot of money building duplicate facilities not needed. We could all do a better job if we try to work this thing out."

"I THINK the feeling is that Schoolcraft and Henry Ford want access to the white area and give Wayne the black area."

"I think our county cannot survive that kind of segregation approach."

Ryan said a bone of contention between has been placement of the facilities of one institution too close to the

district informally assigned to another.

He pointed out WCCC had recently approved a plan to lease with an option to buy Rosary School on Greenfield and Joy, close to Henry Ford Community College.

"IF IT IS WRONG for us to get a place so near Dearborn, then it is just as wrong for Schoolcraft to acquire a facility in Garden City, so close to us, and then be encouraged in this by receiving state money."

"This place is .3 miles north of our line," he continued. "Then they got \$100,000 of state money to expand it."

"I think there ought to be a vehicle for a person like me to try to create better overall coordination and understanding between these institutions."

"I don't think the answer is for WCCC to take over Schoolcraft or Henry Ford, but we should do a better job of working together so as to not duplicate our efforts."

He added that he did not have an instant answer to the problem of different rates of taxation in the different areas, but believed these problems could be worked out.

"I am not in favor of merger, it would make too many people mad. I would aim for local control coupled with overall coordination to avoid unreasonable duplication and the fierce competition over students."

A START HAS already been made, he indicated. The Southeastern Michigan League of Community Colleges has been trying to identify programs at the different colleges in the area to reduce duplication.

Ryan is a member of the board of trustees as a representative of District Seven (Western Wayne County) having joined in June 1968 when the college was organized.

He had been a member of the study committee looking into the establishment of a Wayne County college.

"Last year the college had about 13,000 students, about half of them part-time," Ryan explained. "The me-

dian age of our students was 28 or 29."

The college has served the students by scheduling classes in high schools and other institutions scattered through the area.

"Until recently we have not owned any building where we gave instructional service. However, we are now renovating a Detroit building purchased with funds from the Kresge Foundation."

"The Rosary school we recently leased will give us our first decent instructional center. The property has a convent, 22 acres and a high school in excellent physical condition."

The board and the administration felt they ought to furnish a vocational program, he explained, and the only way they felt they could do it properly was to acquire their own facility. Renting high schools at night would not be feasible.

"WE HAVE HAD tremendous support from the Wayne-Westland School District and Taylor as far as furnishing us with personnel and facilities," he said. "They supported us when we needed it."

Ryan was very interested in pointing out why it is a good idea for a student to attend Wayne County Community College.

"For one thing we're cheaper. Our fee is \$10 a credit hour. The trend is now for students to go to a two-year school when starting college." (Schoolcraft resident tuition is \$11 per credit hour.)

The proximity of Wayne's centers was another advantage in Ryan's opinion. "Our aim is to have a center within 10 minutes of any substantial population area."

"A third advantage is that we have an open door policy in all but the nursing school," he said. "This means we do not ask for an admission test or a high school diploma. This appeals to older people unsure of their skills. We give them a chance to see what they can do. Some have done well and

have gone on to four-year schools."

Ryan feels that WCCC competes favorably with four-year colleges as far as teaching competence is concerned because at the four-year institutions top professors do not teach first and second year students.

"Our faculty is more teaching oriented. We have no 'publish or perish' philosophy. We expect our people to be out there on the firing line — teaching and counseling as opposed to pre-

siding at seminars and working with graduate students."

LOOKING BACK on his contribution to WCCC, Ryan said he "tried to present the Wayne County suburban viewpoint to the college, and in turn carry back information on overall college problems to the suburban areas I represent."

"I also feel I've made some contribution toward the fiscal integrity of the college and helped to get our financial house in order."

## Meatless cooking classes planned

The Plymouth Seventh-Day Adventist Church is offering area residents a chance to beat the high cost of meat and at the same time reduce the saturated fats in their diets.

Classes in vegetarian cooking will be offered in the activity room of the church at 4295 Napier starting Sept. 16.

Many Seventh-Day Adventists are practicing vegetarians and the church members plan to share their expertise in this kind of cooking with others.

Information in the classes will explain how to add variety to the family menu by replacing some meat dishes with low cholesterol vegetarian en-

trees, and make meals more interesting by learning attractive ways to serve vegetables and salads.

The cooking school is divided into four sessions meeting Sept. 16, 18, 23 and 25 at 7:15 each evening. No tuition will be charged.

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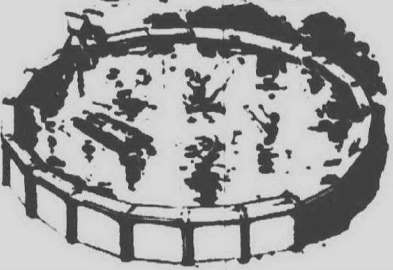
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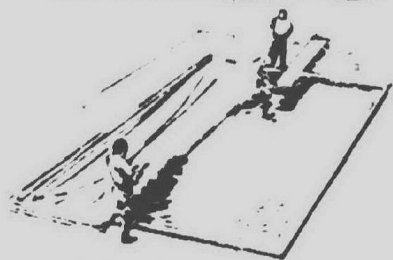
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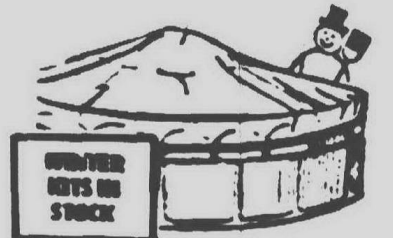

Adult men and women are needed as volunteers at the center located at 15480 Sheldon at Five Mile in Northville Township.

"If we only had more help, more love, more persons taking the time to share themselves, our institutions for the mentally retarded could be transformed into vibrant family-living centers," Schweitzer says.

Paul Williams, psychologist, comments: "Sure you have to break the learning process down to its most fundamental elements, but it can be done."

"With patience and love, every mentally retarded person at the center can grow and most can be prepared for life in the broader community. If we only had help."

SAM CORDARO, recently appointed volunteer coordinator at the center, believes that the help is in the community.

There are enough interested residents to provide a volunteer worker for each of the 950 residents, he believes. "By 1976 we hope to enroll 1,000 volunteers. That would give us one volunteer working with each resident plus many others working in indirect services. I don't know if we will make it, but we are really going to try."

"What better way could we celebrate the bi-centennial of our nation's independence than to give new life and freedom to the mentally re-

tarded? The possibilities boggle the mind. The challenge quickens the heart."

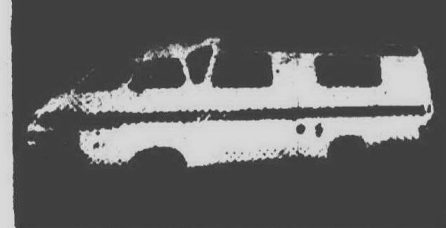

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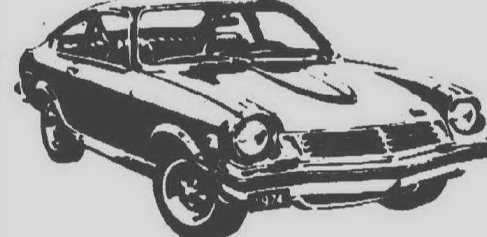
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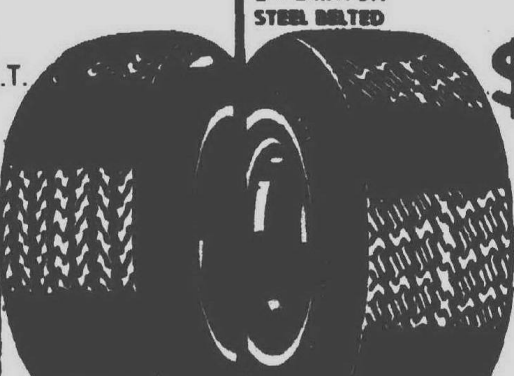
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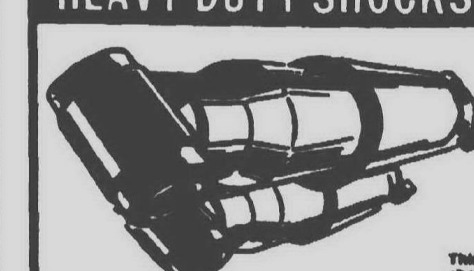
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## Listening to the people

### A day in the life of a candidate reveals what is on the voters' minds

Topic A Monday was the presidential pardon of Richard M. Nixon. Not everyone who met U.S. Rep. Marvin Esch asked about it, but everyone who did felt strongly.

"Tell President Ford he did the right thing. It's time we got this Watergate stuff over," several told Esch as he shook hands and knocked on doors the length of his 2nd Congressional District. Those persons generally spoke softly. Esch just smiled.

"They shoulda shot Nixon," said a teenage boy on a bike on a Livonia street.

Esch's own view is a mixture of the two reactions, neither intense nor pro-Nixon. "I disagree with President Ford's pardon," Esch replied to those who asked his opinion. "The judicial process should have been allowed to take its course. Each citizen should be treated equally under the law."

IT WAS THE FIRST day of Esch's formal campaigning for re-election to a fifth term as 2nd District congressman, and it began at 5:45 in the morning in southern Monroe County, whose townships are suburbs of Toledo.

Then there were campus meetings at the University of Michigan. (One of Esch's Democratic opponents has figured out that the 2nd District has more college students than any congressional district in the nation.)

At the afternoon shift change, Esch was in front of the Ford Motor Co. Sheldon Road plant in Plymouth Township. From there he toured downtown Plymouth, in and out of little shops, followed by the same kind of greeting in Northville.

When Livonia homeowners were eating dinner or sipping iced tea in their yards, Esch and a handful of supporters were ringing doorbells and passing out literature.

As the sun sank in the west, Esch stood on the porch of a converted house at 19600 Farmington Road, his

campaign headquarters in the Wayne County portion of the district, for the formal opening of the office. There were congratulatory telegrams and best wishes for a successful campaign from Sen. Robert Griffin, Sen. Charles Percy of Illinois and President Ford.

"I have a secret weapon for this campaign," Esch said above the roar of K mart-bound traffic — "my wife Olga and my children will take part in this campaign." Son Tom was there. The 16-year-old has completed high school and will take a few months break from academia prior to entering college.

Esch's family has been too young for duty in earlier campaigns. And there's another factor that suburbanites are likely to notice. John Reuther, who is still leading in the Democratic primary, is a bachelor.

(A Reuther aide said early Tuesday that the recount is proceeding in Monroe County. The winner of the cliff-hanging Aug. 6 primary between Reuther and Dr. Edward Pierce won't be decided until Sept. 19.)

MOST PERSONS were a little startled to see a congressman offering a handshake and a pamphlet, and the majority had no questions at all.

One man in Livonia looked at the literature and chided Esch: "I don't see the word 'Republican' on here."

Esch seemed a little embarrassed. "A mistake—we pulled a quote off this pamphlet that had 'Republican' in it. And this other one started off as a piece of non-campaign literature, but we decided to use it in the campaign instead."

Yet it was true that neither the pamphlets nor the signs for Esch, Gov. Milliken and other candidates at Esch's headquarters boasted of the party affiliation. Rep. Donald Riegle, who last year switched to the Democratic column, may have put his finger on the reason in his book "O Congress": The Grand Old Party helps other candidates but not congressmen, leaving them to raise their own funds. Esch admits Riegle is right; the party, Esch said, had done little for him since the Romney landslide of 1966 when Esch and five other young Republicans of moderate views were swept into office along with Sen. Griffin. "The Class of '66" has tended to be an independent bunch ever since.

THE CAMPAIGN in Livonia is going better for Esch this year.

In 1972, post-census redistricting had put Livonia into an unfamiliar political union with an unfamiliar politician. Esch spent a lot of time, shoe leather, and money convincing voters he was "Livonia's congressman."

Monday's walk took him into Precinct 22D, home territory of Democrat Marvin Stempien, whom Esch defeated in 1972. Not only did Esch carry the district, but he carried Stempien's precinct as well.

That precinct is a key one to Esch because his analysts say it's capable of much ticket-splitting. "Two years ago," he says, "I spent a lot of time telling people who I was and what I was running for. This year the recog-

nition factor is up about 500 per cent."

Of the persons who came to the door, only one was totally mystified as to who Esch was. He was a man who had moved in from Detroit two months ago. Flattered to find a congressman at his door, the man invited him in for coffee and promised to register to vote.

THE PARDON was the freshest national issue in everyone's mind in Plymouth and Livonia, but there were other questions too.

Inflation was a topic at the plant gates—far more so than unemployment. "Mortgage money and the inability to purchase homes is bothering them," Esch said.

"I tell them Congress, after 20 months, finally passed the Community Development Act, which has the housing bill in it. It will give some help in the FHA area, ease interest rates, provide some senior citizen housing funding, and give communities some water and sewer funds through revenue sharing."

Referring to the preliminary economic conferences in the White House, Esch said he thinks Ford "will ease up on interest rates." (Econo-

mists at the conference were strong in advising easing of credit, but Ford's two top economic policy makers prefer a continuation of tight money as an anti-inflation policy.)

In a Plymouth clothing store, a tailor thanked Esch profusely for help on an immigration case involving Turkish relatives. "We get 20 or 30 cases a day," Esch explains. "Most are social security and veterans' pension cases. Immigration cases are very rare; we just try to expedite them."

Boys on a Livonia street corner ask about amnesty for draft dodgers, contending the Vietnam War is illegal. Esch tells them that those who evaded the draft broke a law; that they must pay a price for re-entry into American society; that he was long an opponent of the war; but that the Supreme Court had ruled the conflict was legally a war.

"We can't all decide for ourselves which laws we'll obey and which we'll oppose. I agree with the Martin Luther King philosophy: You may think

got to be ready to pay the price," Esch tells them. The boys are polite but don't appear to like the answer.

A MAN WITH a pickup truck wants to know Esch's position on gun control.

"We don't need more federal laws," Esch tells him. "We need to enforce the laws we've got. . . . When I was in the Legislature (he was a state representative in 1965-66), I worked on a law to require that youngsters have

"WHAT ADVANTAGE is there to having Ford as president?" asks a householder who later reveals a concern about taxes.

"Michigan will do better on federal contracts," Esch replies. "And a lot of education fund bills were written with a southern bias. That's because southerners have been so strong on committees. But we're putting limits on the amount of money that's flowing southward."

A man complains that Ford has had nine months (counting his tenure as vice president) to think about national solutions to inflation and still doesn't have a program. He's unhappy about the money Nixon spent on plane trips to Florida and California and Ford's flights to the ski slopes of Colorado.

"We've got to cut government spending," Esch answers, not trying to defend the two presidents. "I'm still driving my '64 Dodge."

A woman remembers the \$850,000 figure for Nixon's pension and retirement staff. "We need to take a close look at that," Esch agrees, "but he gets 300 or 400 pieces of mail a day, and we've gotta have someone help him answer his mail."

"I'm disgusted," the woman replies. "If the election were held tomorrow, I wouldn't vote."

A SUBURBAN landmark two years ago was the rash of defiant signs saying, "This house will not be bused." Today in the Livonia precinct, only one is left. The woman there asks about his position on cross-district school busing.

Esch mentions his amendment to the school aid bill aimed at prohibiting busing but says the Supreme Court decision eliminated the threat of busing.

(Esch is aware, though many Republicans aren't, that the 5-4 Supreme Court decision overturning Federal Judge Stephen Roth's busing decision was made on straight party lines, with Republicans in the majority. But Esch doesn't mention this, saying he doesn't want to "exploit" the busing issue.)

Yet the most frequent topic of conversation is not the pardon or inflation or busing. In this Livonia neighborhood, it seems that three-fourths of the families have dogs, and the dogs all smell the congressman's cuffs. The Esch family is owned by a schnauzer, and so dogs as often as not become the topic of conversation.

# Plea made for out-county courts

Creation of suburban circuit courts would save western Wayne County police departments millions of dollars. That was the view of Dearborn Heights District Judge Richard Dunn who told Westland Rotary Club Thursday of the need for some circuit courts in the out-county area. Dunn, a circuit court candidate in

the Nov. 5 general election, said his survey of the Dearborn Heights police department showed several hundreds of thousands of dollars was wasted by officers driving to downtown Detroit and sometimes waiting several days to give testimony in criminal cases. That money, if saved, would add the equivalent of 1½ patrol cars around the clock. DUNN FELT the same costs could

be saved in other police departments. The judge said a suburban court could be located on 65 acres of vacant county-owned land in Westland or in vacant Wayne County General Hospital space formerly used for its psychiatric division. A renovation of the hospital wing would cost only \$250,000, Dunn said, much less than what it would cost to build or lease space in downtown Detroit. Dunn admitted there are some obstacles in creating suburban circuit courts but they can be overcome. He feels out-county courts would also relieve the long backlog of cases.

THE COURT now has a backlog of 30 to 38 months while local district courts have only a waiting time of up to three months. State law requires circuit judges to be in the county seat but there are changes pending in the House and Senate, Dunn said. There are three Michigan counties which have satellite courts outside the county seat.

Another reason for out-county courts is that the circuit bench is being increased this fall from 28 to 33 and there is a serious space problem already ready for judges.

## Esch opens 2nd District campaign

U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) pledged at the recent opening of his Washtenaw County campaign headquarters in Ann Arbor to wage an issue-oriented re-election effort with heavy emphasis on personal contact with voters from Monroe County to Livonia.

"Our campaign will be a time to reaffirm those principles in government I have always worked for throughout my public career — accessibility, openness, personal contact and constituent problem-solving," said Esch, whose 2nd District includes Livonia, Plymouth, Monroe County and parts of Washtenaw County. THE FOUR-TERM congressman, whose legislative record includes bills ranging from federal budget reform to education and job training, promised to meet constituents "on a one-to-one basis and discuss the issues and problems facing the country."

Esch said it is important for the nation that the next congress consist of men and women of goodwill "who are willing to work together with the new administration to face up to our nation's problems."

In past campaigns, Esch observed, "I have always worked to have an open and direct issue-oriented approach. If there are any innuendoes, misleading statements or 'guilt by association' tactics used in this congressional campaign, they will not be used by me."

ESCH NOTED he and other members of congress will continue dealing with important legislative matters during the upcoming weeks, but added he intends to find the time to meet voters.

These comments were made at the opening of his Washtenaw County campaign headquarters at 2930 Carpenter Road, Ann Arbor. Similar headquarters will be opened in Livonia and Monroe County.

Those present at the Washtenaw headquarters opening included the congressman's family, friends and Esch Volunteers — a group of campaign supporters from throughout the 2nd District.

Purpose is to make participants aware of the current research in the communication sciences which may help facilitate educational change in the U.S. and in Michigan.



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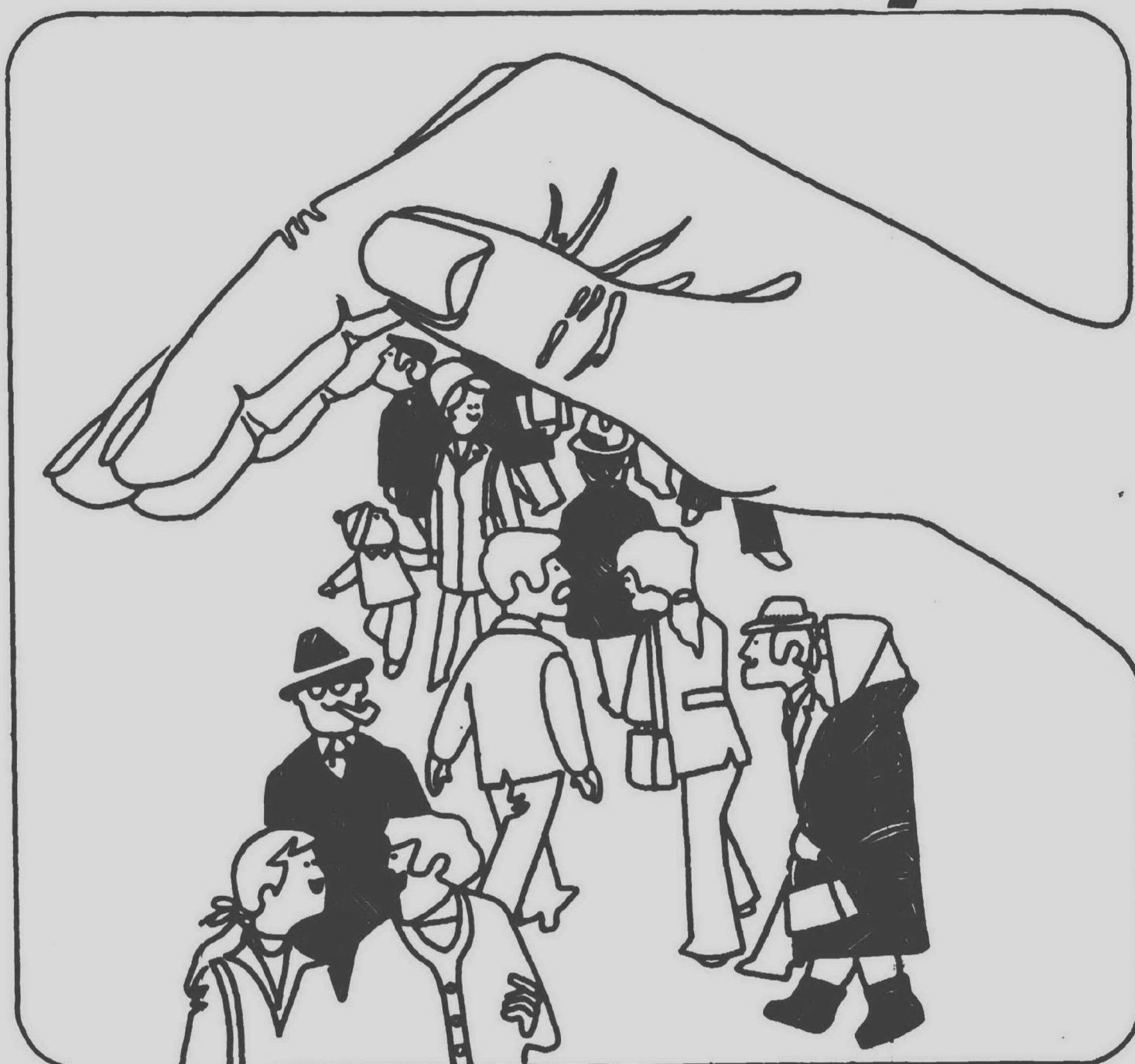
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
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
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
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# Inflation breeds cutbacks by utilities

Two major utilities in Michigan, Consumers Power Company and Detroit Edison, have announced program reductions in an effort to cope with rising expenses.

Consumers Power announced its home service department will be dissolved, as of Sept. 1. The department's advisors have provided special services for thousands of residential customers, mostly women, for the last 40 years.

On Sept. 4, Edison announced another major construction cutback which, along with previous actions, reduces its 1975 expansion plans from a proposed \$686 million to \$300 million.

CONSUMERS' service department began as an effort to help customers understand and effectively use appliances being introduced as part of the electrification of Michigan.

The department has been eliminated as part of the utility's budget-cutting program. Because of falling earnings, the firm has reduced construction and operating programs and reduced its work force by some 500 employees this year.

"We regret having to discontinue a program that has become a virtual institution," says W. Anson Hedgecock, the company's vice president for divisions and customer service. "But until the company's financial position improves, we must curtail or eliminate many services."

The home service demonstrations were started in 1934. Since then, the department has annually conducted more than 4,000 demonstrations throughout the state—about 1,000 for adult groups and 3,000 for youth groups.

In recent years, advisors have provided information ranging from lighting and kitchen planning to consumer buying information about appliances and effective energy use.

A "care and use" demonstration to home economics and consumer education classes in the schools allowed youngsters to learn about the appliances installed in their classrooms, kitchen planning, lighting, laundry, and consumer buying information.

Adult programs ranged from basic kitchen planning and appliance use to special diet classes presented to assist the Michigan Heart Association and the Michigan Diabetic Association.

Special programs for low income groups focused on effective use of appliances and energy, ways to prepare surplus food tastefully and nutritionally, laundering clothes for longer wear, and better appearance and assistance in homeowner counseling classes to avoid repossession.

The company will continue informational services on energy usage, Hedgecock says. The utility's energy consulting services department, with offices in each of its operating divisions, will continue to lend assistance to industrial and commercial customers. The company will also provide residential customers with informational literature upon request.

DETROIT EDISON announced its construction cutback was unavoidable because it has been unable to raise the needed funds to finance its expansion program to meet predicted customer demands for electricity.

The cutback probably will have a detrimental effect on the state's economic well-being for sometime in the future. Company officials express hope, though, that the problem can be solved "with goodwill and common sense" and with the help of the Michigan Public Service Commission (PSC).

"This reduction will be the largest in our company's history," says William G. Meese, president and chief executive officer of Detroit Edison, "and will result in our 1975 construction budget being reduced to almost one-half of what we originally planned."

Indicating that Edison must have adequate rate relief, Meese told the PSC that its residential rates are among the lowest in the country when compared to other large cities. John Hamann, senior executive vice president for operations, also told PSC commissioners that the company's rates are lower than two of the largest municipally owned utilities.

"Thousands of contractor construction workers and technologists will be without jobs," Hamann said. "It is estimated that almost 3,000 jobs will be affected in southeastern Michigan. The higher unemployment caused will mean a loss of taxes to the state."

HAMANN SAID he expects that service to customers will deteriorate

because "they will suffer from more frequent power outages for longer durations."

Robert W. Hartwell, senior executive vice president of finance, explained the cutbacks were unavoidable because Edison has been unable to obtain the capital needed.

Investors have displayed a lack of confidence in the firm because of its inability to obtain adequate rate relief, he claimed, the delays in rate proceedings and the "outdated state statute" covering the state's utilities.

These rate approval delays, coupled

with inflationary prices for labor, materials and construction, he added, "have created grave and urgent financial problems."

Edison's bond rating has been downgraded, earnings on stocks have dramatically decreased, and the utility has had great difficulty selling its stock and bond issues.

Last May, Edison cut its margin of electric generating reserve from 20 to 15 per cent. Then in July further cutbacks in construction were taken to produce cash needed to meet pending bills. The company was then spending about \$1 million more each day than

it was taking in, Hamann added. Hamann stressed that the most recent construction deferrals won't "save" money because ultimately those projects will have to be completed at higher costs.

MEESE SAID in the last nine months, prices in the Detroit area (as measured by the Consumer Price Index) have risen 60.6 per cent while Edison rates, during that same period, increased by only 23.5 per cent.

Edison has also reduced the number of its employees by about 1,000 through attrition, Hartwell added, closed customer offices, cut travel by employees, and reduced the use of outside professional consulting services.

Meese commented: "If we don't face realities, if we avoid the tough decisions needed to meet this crisis, all of us will pay dearly — utility companies and their shareholders, state government, business and industry and, most importantly, the people of Michigan."

"With good will and common sense,

we can meet our mutual obligations to the people of this state. In doing so, we can help assure a strong and vigorous economy for Michigan."

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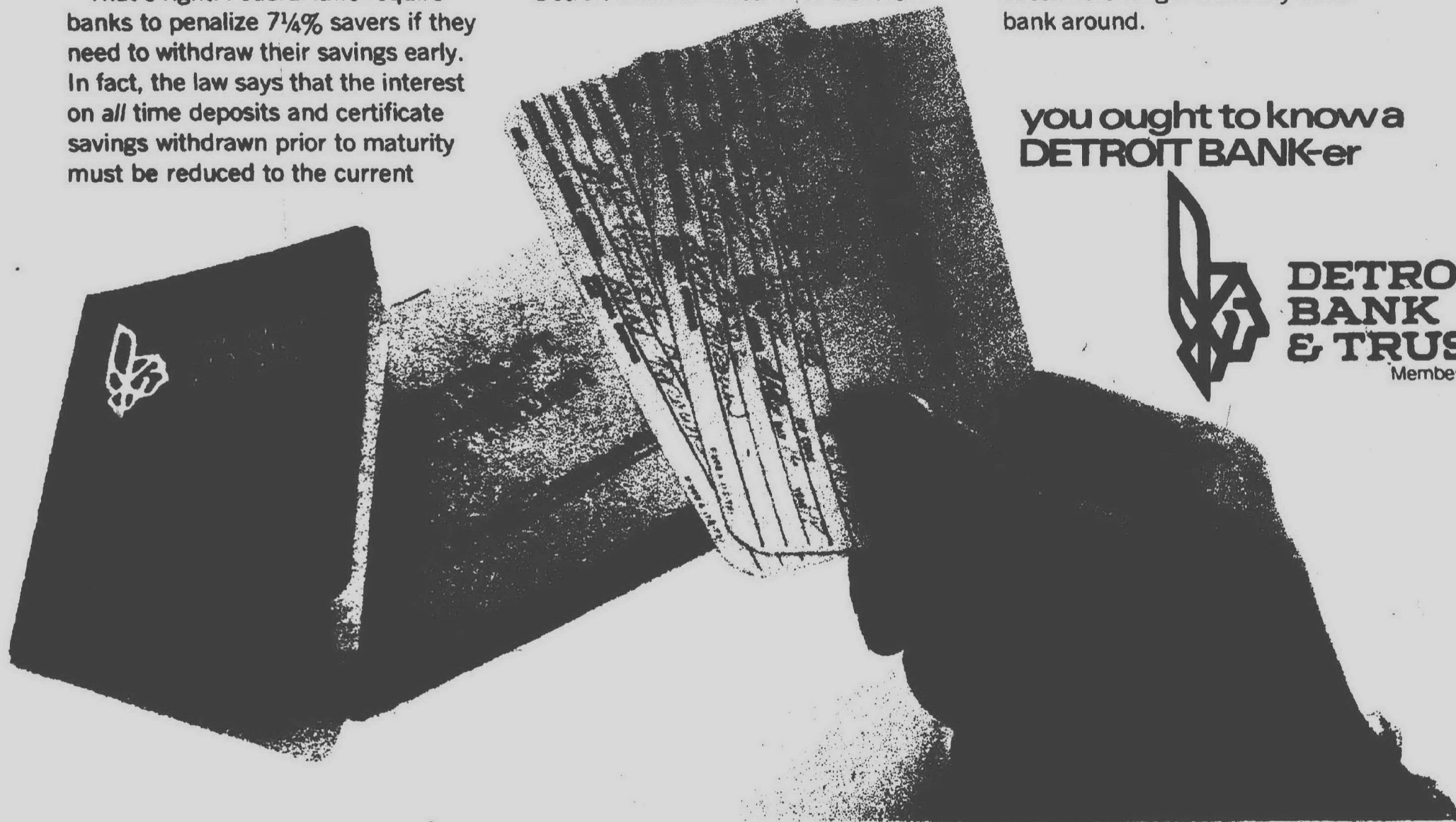
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## Equestrian village to open

A residential community developed for horse lovers will open its Kentucky-style gates Sunday, Aug. 25, in northern Oakland County.

Bloch Equestrian is located in Independence and Brandon townships at Oak Hill and Perry Roads. Homesites, called "mini-ranches," range from three to 10 acres with wooden fences.

Lots will run from \$20,000 up, and building restrictions will place home and barn costs at \$45,000 and up.

The brainchild of Harry Bloch, president of Bloch Brothers Corp., the development will feature 25 miles of bridle paths, a communal barn, a central show ring and a spring-fed lake.

The concept has been implemented in other states but is new to Michigan.

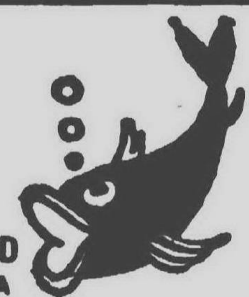

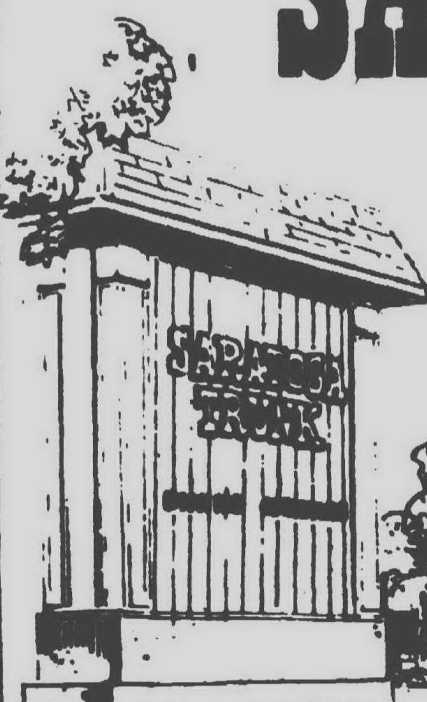

Second place ribbons went to Hugh Jarvis and Wayside Gifts.

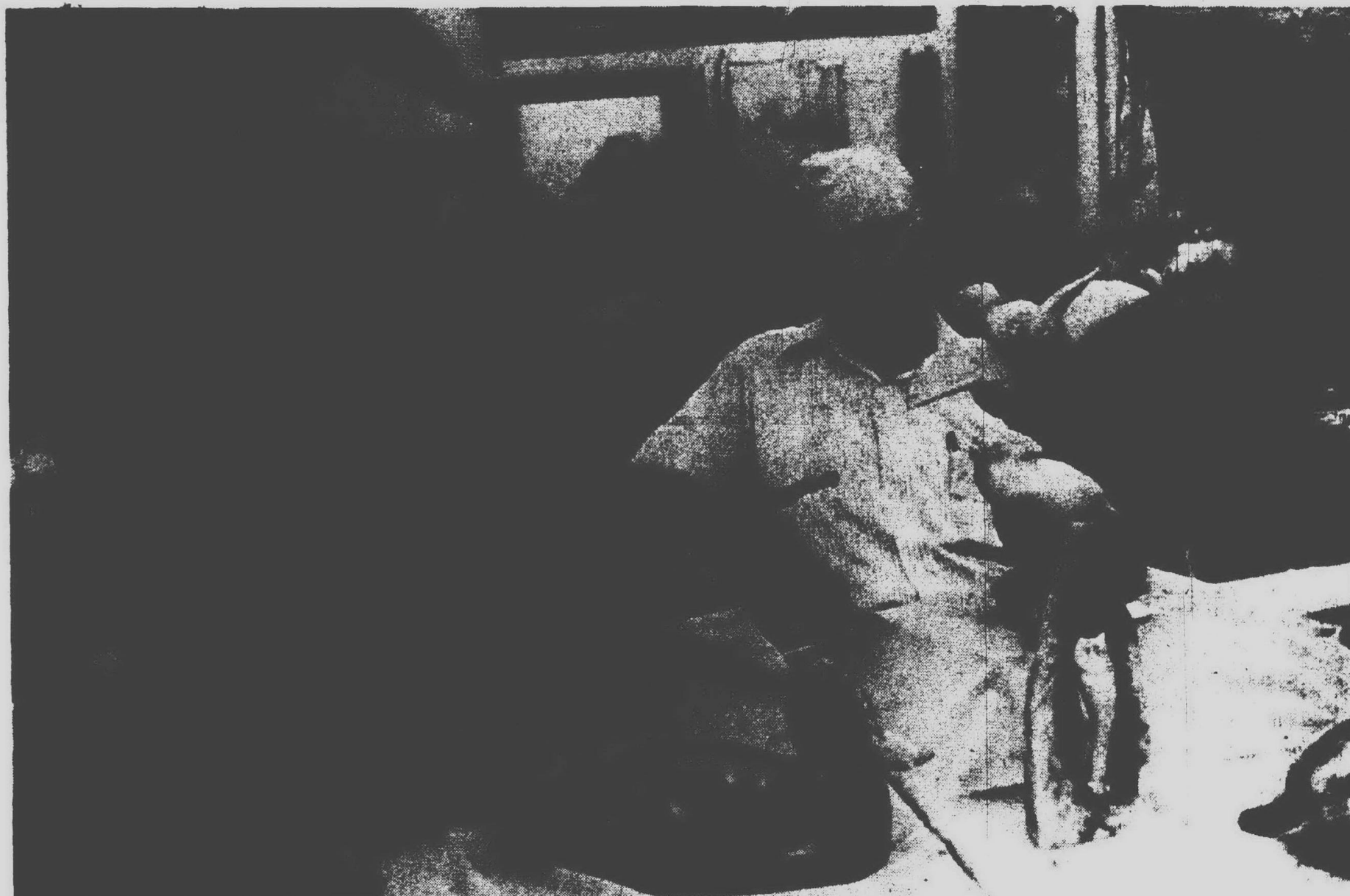
It was a white ribbon for the Old Village Flower Shop with a "Back again" ice cream social.
