Owners sound requiem

Thunderbird Inn closes doors for suburban diners

A solemn requiem was sounded Saturday for one of the most popular watering places in the area. It was a day of sadness for many longtime employes of the Thunderbird Inn, long associated with the social and business life of the Plymouth community as well as Livonia, Northville, Canton Township, Farmington, Redford Township, Garden City and Westland.

Reborn 13 years ago under the dynamic partnership of Arthur Koberzynski, John Kline and John Carlo and built to the point where it was termed the area's most popular night spot, the Thunderbird closed its doors Saturday for the final time.

The Thunderbird came into being when Koberzynski and his associates made a feasability study of the area several years ago which revealed a need for an ultra-modern, luxury type motel with a cocktail and dining lounge.

With that as the base, the Thunderbird management found a group willing to invest in such a venture and started work on the project some four years ago. Unfortunately, the financing didn't work out as planned, work dragged as contractor and sub-contractors demanded payment and then work halted entirely in August of 1973.

Since that time it has been a question of finances and getting new assistance. When this didn't take place, Investors Diversified Service, which is reported to hold a mortgage for \$3.8

million, decided to take action for foreclosure.

That action took place three months ago and 90 days had to elapse for a possible mortgage redemption. The deadline for that period actually was Friday but the management had permission to hold back the official closing until Saturday . . . thus the solemn requiem was delayed one day.

The future of the Thunderbird Inn? No information has been received from IDS but it is believed it will make every effort to complete the elaborate plans for a large motel with dining facilities for parties up to 1,600 and a large enclosed swimming pool.

A recent tour of the half-finished facilities showed where the swimming pool has been laid out, the dining rooms have been used for numerous parties during the past winter and this spring and summer and most of the new bedrooms and meeting rooms are partially completed.

But where the estimated cost was \$4.5 million four years ago, inflation has taken its toll and new estimates place the cost of finishing the structure and furnishing it in the neighborhood of \$6.5 million.

Some announcement is expected from IDS officials in a few days about the future plans but the Thunderbird Inn is closed today for the first time

The Thunderbird, opened by the late Walter Smith 16 years back after his bar and lounge The Cavalcade Inn burned to the ground on its Northville

Road site about a mile and a half west of the present building, had been idle for 14 months when Koberzynski and his associates took it over.

Smith had been killed in an auto accident and patronage gradually dropped to the point where the place was closed.

The three partners redecorated and renovated the Thunderbird before reopening the doors and then stressed good food, good drinks and excellent entertainment. The result was the popularity of the new Thunderbird Inn spread far and wide.

Such big name bands as Woody Herman, the Glenn Miller orchestra, Ink Spots, Eddie Peabody and the Harmonicats graced the stage of the night club over the years and its fame continued to spread.

It became a popular stopover for fans attending the University of Michigan games and those going to the running races in the afternoon and the harness races at night.

"With our start in 1961, I'd say wecatered to more than 2,000,000 folks over the years," recalled Koberzynski, "Many big business deals were finalized in our dining rooms and I'd hate to estimate the number of new cars sold in our lounge dining

There were almost tears in his eyes 2 as he recalled the hundreds of weddings, anniversaries, retirement parties, political rallies and the like held at the Thunderbird over the years.

"We had as many as 100 weddings a year," he said. "Now some of the

brides of the earlier years come back for dinners with their children. guess you'd almost have to say that this was the place for one of the happiest and biggest moments in their lives and they just like to come back and relax and enjoy themselves."

Koberzynski pointed out that the Thunderbird had major parties most of the year. The big rush usually started in April and continued through the middle of July.

Then there was the big crush during the holiday season which started the Saturday after Thanksgiving and continued until mid-January.

"Will I miss these events?" And then he answered his own question with: "Sure, I'll miss them. They were always just as exciting to me as to the ones putting on the parties.

"There was the challenge of getting the food prepared and ready on time, of serving it so that everyone had a hot meal. Then getting the tables cleared so that all would have coffee and dessert at the same time. It was always a challenge and I always had a great feeling of pride when we accomplished all of these things."

What does the future hold for Art and his father-in-law, John Kline, now their pride and joy is closed and they are out in the cold?

Just a shrug of the shoulders from Koberzynski with the implied answer "We'll find something soon but right now our plans are . . . " and another shrug of the shoulders.

Decision due by commission on loop road

PLYMOUTH-The city commission is expected to receive a resolution Monday to consider a loop road in downtown Plymouth. If the resolution for consideration is adopted, a vote on the controversial system is likely to come within the next few weeks.

After 20 years of debate the project is still mired in apprehension and misunderstanding, but some essential facts and theories stand out.

A look at the loop road according to city planner Jay Eldridge:

FACT: The loop streets-Ghurch. Harvey, Wing, Deer and Union-already exist and will not have to be widened.

FACT: At least initially, the loop would carry two-way traffic.

FACT: Only four homes along the loop will be affected by construction of curves necessary to round off the route.

FACT: Construction of the curves would cost a minimum of \$346,000.

FACT: While several new shops have opened, there has been little major development in recent years in the central business district.

FACT: Some work has already been done on the loop. Union Street has been extended through the tip of Kellogg Park and Deer Street has been widened from Wing to Ann Arbor

The facts are easy to come by, but the project cannot be separated from its anticipated effects.

SPECULATION: The loop is a first step in revitalizing downtown and insuring that it will prosper rather than fall into decay.

SPECULATION: The loop will give definite boundaries to the central business district, encouraging commercial development within its limits and keeping neighborhoods outside the loop residential.

SPECULATION: Without the loop there is almost nothing to stop runaway "strip development," where commercial growth lines main arteries such as Main Street, pushing into residential areas and altering the "central" quality of downtown.

SPECULATION: Existing and future parking facilities-considered a must by merchants if the city is to prosper-will tie in with the loop road, allowing shoppers to avoid downtown traffic congestion by entering a parking lot directly from the loop. The loop is intended to provide this easy access, not to carry traffic away from downtown.

SPECULATION: A commerciallystrong downtown could provide the city with up to 20 per cent of its state equalized valuation (tax base), compared to the current approximately 8.1 per cent.

SPECULATION: The loop is a necessity if pedestrian malls are created downtown.

The planning commission has unanimously agreed that the loop road is the city's top priority need in coming years, but the final decision rests with the city commission and several commissioners have yet to come out for or against the project.

According to Commissioner John Cummings, the essential question is: What will happen to Plymouth if it

In a nutshell, planner Eldridge sees an eventual decline in the "viability" of the central business district. "You're going to have a tough time convincing an investor to come in

analysis

with a substantive investment of any sort and downtown is going to have a tough time holding its remaining businesses. The loop road is evidence of a commitment on the part of the city to an overall scheme to invigorate downtown business.

Most downtown merchants are strongly in favor of the loop. The board of directors of the Chamber of Commerce resolved unanimously to ask the city commission to back the

Some commissioners who are undecided have indicated that they might support the loop road if it were clear how it would be financed.

According to Eldridge, money for rounding off the corners of the loop might come from either a special assesment district levy or from the city's capital improvements fund. which will be worth an estimated \$485,000 over the next five years.

Both approaches could meet with opposition-either among the property owners involved in a special assessment or with conflicting capital improvment needs.

THE MECHANICAL problems of financing and constructing the curves seem to be the chief concerns of those commissioners who are hesitant about the loop.

Hamill era ends in township

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP - An era is coming to an end this week in Plymouth Township.

On Oct. 13 Herald F. Hamill, the engineer who knows where every water pipe and sewer crock is located in the entire area, will have fulfilled his contractural agreement with the Township after 18 years of service.

In that stretch of time he was responsible for laying out the water system and later the sewer and sidewalk programs as the township continued to grow and there was need for more services.

With the completion of his contract the township now plans to operate on a day-to-day basis. But whoever gets the assignment will be operating on the foundation built by the slow talking, portly gent who they claim "knows more about what is underground than any other human within the area and miles around."

A graduate of the University of Michigan with the class of 1920, he went to work even before he received his diploma and after he doffed the mortar board and gown he worked with the state highway commission, the Pere Marquette Railroad and Prof. Harry Atwell to build up the experience for municipal work.

Back in 1950 when the City of Livonia was incorporated he was the engineer who had begun the operation of a water system during the township days. Once the city was incorporated he went to work on a sewer plan and later played a leading role in the early change-over from farm land to residential developments. In this work he cooperated fully with the State Health Departments and the State Highway Commission.

He remained with the City of Livonia until 1966 when he switched his base of operations to the City of

Plymouth where he aided again with a water and sewer system during a period of growth.

For the next three years he was the man to see about the water and sewers in the city. Then, in the midst of that assignment he was called by the township officials to lay out a water system. He had been working for some time on the possibility and in 1957 he inaugurated the system.

He supervised the building of the huge tank in Lakepointe Village and there were times he, personally, operated the system. As it grew and there was need for an overseer and manager, Mrs. Elizabeth Holmes, the township treasurer, was named to the

It is ironic that while the Hamill era is ending Mrs. Holmes, who declined to run for re-election, is ending an era of her own with the finish of this term in November.

While all of this work in and around Plymouth was taking place Herald established an office in downtown Plymouth and remained there until 1970 when he took in a partner - Richard Brender - and moved to new. headquarters in the Gould Industrial Park in the Township.

Born in Otisville in 1904, he developed an inspiration to be a civil engineer early in life. And after building up his experience he opened his own office in March of 1926. While known statewide as an engi-

neer the people of the Plymouth community will always recall him as the short, stout fellow who wore the typical Russian hat in the midst of winter. He always was a familiar sight in downtown Plymouth.

Though his contractural obligations with the township are ending Herald is by no means giving up his work.
"Oh no." he said, "this is my life and
I'll stick to it."

Area police officials feel state is attempting to usurp local control

"It looks like big brother is watching me and taking over my department," says Livonia Police Chief Robert Turner

"Big brother can't even take care of himself very well."

The big brother the chief is referring to is the State of Michigan. And if recommendations suggested in the Michigan Department of Justice's goals and standards report are implemented, the Livonia Police Department could become part of a regional police department.

SO COULD police departments in Plymouth, Westland and Garden City and the police chiefs in those cities are no more happy with the report than Turner.

Redford Township Chief of Police Edwin Gleza has little comment on the report. His department hasn't

even received a copy. "They were supposed to send copies of the report to municipalities with more than 25,000 people. We have 75,000 here," Gleza said. The Redford chief saw copies of the report at the national police chief's convention in Washington, D.C., last week, but officially would not comment on a report he has not received.

The report suggests a 'regionalization' of police and justice activities under a central jurisdiction in Lansing.

According to Plymouth Chief of Police. Timothy Ford. who was speaking as president of the Wayne County Chiefs of Police, the centralization would make the criminal justice departments of the municipalities more

"But," Ford cautioned, "the most efficient police forces in the world were the SS in Germany during World War Il and the current Russian secret po-

Ford also contends centralization would remove the police forces from the people of the community they

"It is to a policeman's advantage to

serve the people in the community he works, and to the community's advantage to have some sort of control over its police force.

"A policeman can't serve the community if he is responsible to Lan-

Ford also expressed concern that if the suggestions in the report were implemented, "it could start us down a road from which we couldn't return."

THERE IS provision in the report for implementation procedures, but it is uncertain how strong the clout of the state would be in forcing municipalities to adopt the proposals.

If the report is implemented, the state could withold federal Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) funds. But the actual dollar amount lost by local agencies is uncer-

The recommendations of the task force committees may not be adopted if Governor Milliken rejects the report in part or in total.

Ford expressed doubts the report would be accepted as currently writ-

THE STATE has already added more than 40 pages of errata to the report and final public hearings have not been completed.

Richard Nelson, project director for the task forces which compiled the report, admitted that there was a serious problem with the way the report was distributed. but did say that the recommendations in the report were, "good ones, and should go a long way towards standardizing law enforcement in the state."

Seventy-eight persons, representing police departments, courts, prosecutor's offices and lay groups spent more than 14 months in drafting the original report.

PUBLIC HEARINGS were held Sept. 18 in Wayne and Oakland counties dealing specifically with the recommendations in the reports.

The first public hearings did nothing to lessen the disgruntlement of local police chiefs.

"We didn't have a chance to study the report before the hearings." said Garden City Chief of Police, Robert Behrendt. "It would be an understatement to say that we were upset with the way the report was dis-

The state commission had asked the chiefs to make recommendations in writing before the hearings, but the time element interferred.

Westland Police Chief William Rechlin was most disturbed by the provisions in the report for the handling of juvenile offenders.

"We have a bad system now, but the report's recommendations are incorrigible." Rechlin said.

THE CRIMINAL justice department's goals and standards task forces have scheduled a new public hearing in Lansing Oct. 30 where local chiefs will be represented.

It is uncertain what changes, if any, will be made in the final report sent to the governor, but no final action has been scheduled prior to the end of November at the earliest.

"The concept of goals and standards for police departments is excellent," Ford said, "if those goals are obtainable. I think if the people who worked on this report were to review it, maybe they too would wonder if the standards they proposed were the

Road.closings cut off subdivision lifeline

CANTON- Residents in Canton's Holiday Park subdivision are playing their own version of "Jeopardy"-a game of detours that perils life and limb.

But, frankly, they aren't the only participants. Anyone living in the Plymouth area unwittingly has to join the game whether they want to or not. Bus-riding school children probably have suffered the most.

Holiday Park residents, however. are the hardest hit because of the limited ingress and egress to the 525single family subdivision at the easterly edge of the township.

The game strategy is simple, but challenging: figure out a route to downtown Plymouth without using Joy Rd. (which runs in front of the subdivision), Ann Arbor Rd. or Ann Arbor Trail, and without having to go so far east that' you go through parts of Livonia and Westland.

Cutting through the nearby subdivision of Timberlea Farms almost worked until police intervened. Trying to get around a no-left-turn off Joy into the subdivision, drivers were looping through adjacent Canton Gardens apartments and coming straight across Joy until irate apartment dwellers apparently alerted police and the ticketing began.

Normally, Holiday Park residents would use Joy Rd. to get anywhere west, but that's closed because of extensive repair work on the bridge spanning the I-275 expressway.

Only open a few months, the bridge was closed without any advance notice to township officials to repair a sewer line break that will require a 45-ft. tunnel.

Efforts to get at least one traffic lane open have been futile so far. However, a ray of hope surfaced late last week when county officials agreed to send an engineer down to meet with Fire Chief Mel Paulun to discuss the opening of an "emergency" lane at least. An "on site" inspection is expected sometime this week. The repair work is expected to be completed by Nov. 1, county officials promised township officials.

Ann Arbor Rd. is closed for construction by the state of a bridge over the expressway and Ann Arbor Trail is closed because of a paving project.

While the situation is tough for Holiday Park residents, Plymouth School District bus drivers are forced to play "beat the clock" as well as detour dodgem in order to maintain a bus schedule that has some students boarding as early as 6:30 a.m.

"The detours are killing us." commented Robert Houghton, Plymouth School District transportation chief. He said the snarled traffic pattern has the bus schedule running 20 to 25 minutes late, except for about five of Plymouth's 40 routes.

had to be done "by a bunch of idiots," Houghton said bluntly. "They had all summer to pave."

He was notified of the detours two days before the regular opening of school, Houghton said. Fortunatelyor unfortunately, as the case may be-school didn't open on time because of the teachers' strike and Houghton had time to juggle the routes.

The inconvenience caused by three 'main roads paralleling each other being closed isn't what bothers Holi-

day Park residents the most. Their real fear is that something calamitous could happen and help wouldn't reach them in time.

A recent fire in the wooded area adjacent to Holiday Park "just plain scared us." Homeowners nearest the fire literally "sweated out" the 20-25 Making those kinds of road changes minutes it took Canton firemen to at the beginning of the school year reach the area via Koppernick and

Haggerty Rds. Both are unpaved and Haggerty, in particular, is in tough shape because of the heavy truck traf-

fic using the road, the residents note. Add to this the fact that any vehicle using this route must cross unguarded railroad tracks-not once, but twice. School buses are also forced to use

this route. An interesting question was posed at the recent board of trustees' meeting by a person in the audience. Who will be liable in the event a serious fire hits either Holiday Park or adjacent Deer Creek apartments.

Holiday Park? The question went unanswered. It's this nagging fear that keeps Holiday Park residents bugging township

Registrations to open for junior basketball

PLYMOUTH — Registration for the Plymouth Community Junior Basketball Association's 11th season of competition will open Saturday. Oct. 12. with more than 700 boys and girls expected to be enrolled by the time the first games are played.

Registration will continue the two following Saturdays, Oct. 19 and 26, and all sessions will be from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at West Middle School, Sheldon Road at Ann Arbor Trail. Each youngster should be accompanied by a parent and the fee is \$7.50.

Poor residence numbers irk township firemen

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP-A township ordinance requiring street addresses on houses and buildings to be displayed in a prominent manner. still is being ignored by many residents.

Fire Chief James Gignac, whose department has made a concerted effort to inform residents and businesses of Ordinance 35; said he realizes some residents are still unaware they are viólating a township ordinance by not having proper numbers displayed.

"I have sent letters to business firms and home owners in the township advising them of the ordinance which was adopted for their protection," Gignac said.

"I have received numerous complaints from police agencies and fire department drivers over this lack of proper street numbers.

"There have been occasions where an emergency unit has been sent to an address, but can't locate it. This can be a matter of life or death in some instances.

"Some houses have no numbers,

some are too far back from the road to read or they are too small or blurred to be recognized.

"This is particularly true on night

"There have been times at night when our units have had to go up and down a street, flashing the spotlight, in an effort to find the address."

The township ordinance says. "Every residential building located at a distance no greater than 90 feet from the closest public road right of way shall have Arabic numerals displayed at, on or near the front door where they shall be readily visible to occupants of fire department vehicles on the public road.

"The size of the Arabic numerals shall be at least three inches and not more than five inches in height. The color shall be in contrast with the immediate background on which they are mounted. The numerals shall be displayed in a manner to be readily visible during all hours of normal

Gignac said the recently popular old

English script type address signs are all right providing the house also has Arabic numerals near the front door on contrasting background.

The ordinance also covers business places. It states:

"Every building occupied, used or intended for use as an assembly, business, educational, storage or institution shall have Arabic numerals displayed in such a manner as to be readily visible to the occupants of fire department vehicles on the public road immediately in front of said building.

Gignac said his department can't go door-to-door informing residents of the violation.

"This is up to the individual or the neighborhood groups.

"This ordinance doesn't only cover home owners, but includes apartment complexes. Numerals on apartments should be visible from the nearest road," he added.

"I'm concerned that it's going to involve much more than \$500,000," said Commissioner John Moehle.

Both Eldridge and Cummings suggest going ahead with the loop one step at a time. "Let's just get the right-of-way first, then do the construction." Eldridge said.

Eldridge insists. however, that the curves are vital to the success of the loop. "One of the most important aspects of the system is the 'rounding off' of the corners at Wing and Deer. Wing and Harvey, Harvey and Church and Union and Church Streets," Eldridge wrote in the Vilican-Leman Associates development program for the central business district.

According to that report, the curves would allow speeds of at least 25 miles per hour. Eldridge said that the road would be three lanes. 36 feet wide, with the center lanes for left turns only. He also suggests that the city acquire a 60-foot right-of-way that would permit eventual construction of sidewalks and planting strips.

Commissioner Harold Guenther has been one of the loop road's strongest supporters. "I've never been anything but for it," he said. "Let's accept it in principle. We've got to think about phasing it in."







High 'quality of life' proposed in master plan

The Wayne County Planning Commission has proposed a long-term development strategy for Wayne Coun-

It is described as a county-wide point of view with planning proposals for the future for the county as a whole. "It isn't a master plan," stresses Donald Juchartz, chairman of the county planning commission. "The county cannot impose a plan on 43 local units of government, including Detroit."

The "development strategy" has been presented to the public works committee of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors in a series of discussions over the past two months. That committee, chaired by Commissioner John Lesinski (D-Dearborn), will make recommendations to the full board.

THE PROPOSED plan is the result of a four-year study by the planning commission, its staff and outside ecology, urban economics, and public administration consultants.

In releasing the report, Juchartz urged that local communities cooperate with their neighbors in weighing all the long-range effects of urban development. "This report challenges some assumptions which are widely held in government-such as that industrial growth always adds rather than detracts from the tax base and that 'big' is better.

"We want to maintain a certain quality of life in our metropolitan area. We aren't going to do that if haphazard, uncontrolled development con-

"I for one believe we ought to evaluate where we are and where we want to go, particularly in the emerging areas west of Detroit where growth often is occurring faster than we can cope with it in our own

Juchartz, who is director of the Wayne County Cooperative Extension Service, a county-state-federal service, stressed three points:

Of 43 local cities and townships in the county. 37 have master plans which are not coordinated and could lead to chaos; there is an excess of land zoned for industry; and, a lack of land preserved for agriculture and recreation.

"We found that the land now set aside in Wayne County for industrial expansion by the year 2000 is several times greater in square miles than all the land used by industry in the last 150 years," Juchartz said.

"All available evidence indicates this is totally unrealistic and threatens to waste millions of dollars in wasteful competition for industry and site preparation such as sewers, water and roads."

There will be plenty of opportunity for local officials to react and respond to the county's development strategy and to participate in future changes. be added.

THE 100-PAGE two-section development strategy proposal for Wayne County also recommends:

Expanded County activity in providing recreational programs and facilities under direction of a new county recreation commission:

A county multi-purpose solid waste disposal program-that would separate and utilize acceptable refuse for building of hills for scenic purposes and for year-round recreational activity such

as hiking, skiing and tobogganing; A transportation system that would provide public transportation on a round-the-clock basis to every area of the county both inner city and out-

A Wayne County Housing Commission (this proposal is presently in discussion by the board of commissioners) with power to provide housing for the elderly in suburban areas that lack local programs;

A mid-decade census in 1975 to get facts on population shifts and resulting changes in the total county needs; A declaration of county policy to preserve agricultural lands for both envirvonmental purposes and to provide fresh produce for urban dwellers

in the County. A program of full utilization of such new communications techniques as cable television and of information processing techniques being perfected by computer technology;

An Environmental Concerns Council to monitor a wide variety of inter-related environmental problems and developments for the board of commissioners;

A long-term building program for county government facilities that would include construction of a new county courthouse near the Murphy Hall of Justice at Gratiot and Beaubien in downtown Detroit, other courts and jails in western Wayne County, and branch offices for various county services to be located closer to the people; and

A comprehensive, coordinated system for both providing health and social services to people, particularly the young, the old, and the poor.



Livonia firm gets I-94 bid

Greenfield Construction Company of Livonia and Kensington Corporation of Novi were lowest of eight bidders with a joint bid of \$3 million for modernization of 6.7 miles of I-94 in De-

The project involves grading, drainage structures, concrete median paving and concrete median barrier on I-94 between Gratiot and Eight Mile with a completion date of late 1975.

The project was among 24 on which bids were taken Sept. 18 in Lansing. In earlier action, the Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation announced plans for construction of a center lane for left turns on Newburgh at Warren. Marquette, Cherry Hill, Palmer and Glenwood Roads in Westland and Wayne.

That project will cost an estimated \$1.9 million and be financed by the Federal Aid Urban Program. Estimated completion time is December

WCCC enrollment up for fall term

Through the final day of registration. Sept. 13, credit hour enrollment was up 11 per cent from last fall. This translates to about 14,000 students who are attending WCCC's 23 instructional centers throughout Wayne Coun-

The college's newest instructional center. the former Rosary High at 8551 Greenfield, enrolled the third highest number of students of all centers with about 1,400 signed up for day and night classes.

The largest center continues to be Nativity Center on Detroit's east side which enrolled 2,500 students. Mooney Center on Detroit's west side enrolled about 2,100 students.



It's time for final action on loop road

For more than 16 years the proposed loop road in downtown Plymouth has been a topic of discussion and the time now has come to either approve it or store the plans in the archives for some future generation of historians to gaze upon.

Teen-agers have grown to manhood and middle aged men have grown old during these discussions which started back in 1958. On five occasions the loop has been brought before the City Commission and each time it has been shelved for one reason or another.

Now it is coming up again — on Monday night — and the Commission still is divided in its opinion of the proposal that has been sought by many businessmen. They have termed the loop a real saviour to the downtown area

At the time it was first proposed the loop road was to enclose the downtown area from Church Street to Wing and from Union to Harvey and thus provide plenty of area for new business and parking.

AT THE TIME THERE was the hope the area would become one of the outstanding shopping centers within the suburban community. And

there were signs the goal would be accomplished until the property owners boosted their prices and scared away the developers.

It was put on the shelf only to be taken down from time to time for further discussion — but never with the townspeople until the public hearing just a week ago.

While all of these discussions were taking place the suburban area changed quite a bit. Where it once was devoid of concentrated places to shop, new developments came into being in such places as Westland, Livonia and even Northville.

Still the loop road was only a dream.

One of the last times it was shelved, several years ago, the reason was said to be the need for further study to determine the degree of the curves—as if a speedway were being planned.

Meanwhile, many of the merchants moaned over the fact that their potential customers were now going out of town to do their shopping and asked that the loop road be revived.

It is a known fact some of them purposely delayed their modernization programs— waiting for action on the loop road. They are still waiting and ready to move if, and when, the loop is approved.

MEANWHILE MANY OF the townspeople now are taking a stand against the loop, claiming they don't want to pay taxes for the benefit of the downtown businessmen. They don't heed the claim that the loop could be paid for with the federal revenue sharing funds made available each year to the city.

Some are making demands the loop should be a special assessment district and those who benefit should be made to pay for it.

Not much thought is being given by this group to the fact that with the building of the two expressways— I-275 and M-14 — Plymouth will be stuck in a corner and possibly forgotten.

That's the fear of the businessmen at the moment and it could be possible the oldtimers, who don't want the area disturbed, will be stuck with

Whatever the outcome Monday night, the time is here when the City Commission should take positive action and turn its collective minds to other things so badly needed.

Not all of today's drama takes place on the legitimate stage.

It is not all seen in the movies. Or on the TV set in your living room. Many of the most touching scenes are those in the neighborhood supermarkets where the parents of children battle with the high price of food in their quest for the vittles necessary to nourish their children.

Walk up and down the aisles of any of our modern supermarkets and you can see these mothers and fathers standing in front of some choice morsel. You'll see them stand-and look-possibly pondering whether they can afford it.

This came to the Stroller's attention the other afternoon when he sauntered into one of the modern markets-just to look around. He doesn't battle with the prices. He leaves that up to the lady who runs our home as she can tell just what she can and can't do.

On this particular afternoon The Stroller stood at the end of the meat counter, keeping an eye on each potential customer as they gazed at the choice cuts along the way.

Then along came a woman with three little kiddies at her side. She stopped at every section of the meat display and with each stop she looked at the meat, then down at the children. You could almost sense the desire that was burning inside—a desire to give her children the best to help build their bodies.

It was a touching sight. A fond mother with the welfare of her children at heart pondering should she or shouldn't she pay the price regardless of what it did to her budget.

SHE STOOD FOR a few moments. Then she lifted up the parcel of meat, looked at the children again, and then placed the meat back on display. It was pure drama. But there were more to follow.

She walked around the market a bit more—then returned to the meat counter and picked up the package of meat and placed it in her basket, and walked away.

A decision had been made, but there was a wondering look in her face as she took the smallest child by the hand and walked away.

Then, all of a sudden, she returned and tenderly placed the meat back in the pit. It was evident that she decided the luxury of the steak was beyond her fondest wishes.

Standing there, taking in the touching sight, The Stroller was taken back to his childhood days when he, too, ac-

companied his widowed mother on these Saturday afternoon shopping tours.

Things were much different then.
There was no such help as welfare, food stamps, or unemployment compensation. In times of stress the mothers were on their own to eke out an existence as best they could.

There was one particular stretch of gloomy economy when The Stroller's mother, who hired out to do house work for the more affluent, was forced to call on her ability as a pie baker to to provide food for the table. Oh, it wasn't that she baked pies for her children. She baked the pies for sale to the more fortunate families—and we kids delivered them.

MANY WERE THE times when she arose long before daybreak on a Sunday morning so that the pies would be ready for delivery when we returned from Sunday School. She even improvised baskets that held as many as

six pies. And delivering them was quite an art. But her baking ability helped save the day .

The trips to the grocer's and the butcher's bring back fond memories, too. For, way back there, the butchers didn't sell all of the meat as they do today. The liver and kidneys were considered surplus. And many were the times when mother purchased a bit of round steak and found that the butcher had enclosed a kidney or a piece of liver in the package for good meas-

Because of this generosity. Mother never had to stand with her children and gaze at the meat in wonderment as mothers are doing while supplying today's drama of the supermarket. Things are a lot different now with the spiraling economy where you may have money, but can't pay the high asking prices.

As The Stroller's sister wrote in her last letter: "These days a person has to be rich to go to the poor house."

What I couldn't handle I took out on my children'

They sat there in the church in Livonia looking very much like college girls lingering to have a final word with their professor.

In their attractive halter tops and blue jean shorts they certainly did not look like child abusers.

But the fact that they had abused their children was the reason they had come to this group therapy session sponsored by Parents Anonymous, an organization currently trying to make a dent in the child

"I verbally abuse the kids - never physically. Emotionally they have been hurt. I take out all my anger on them. It was mostly the situation with my husband that caused my anger. I couldn't tell him how I felt about my

problems so I took it out on mr kids. "I know I don't want to be like that, but I have to take one thing at a

MRS. JANSMA pointed out that Sue had begun to give her children a lot more positive attention.

make me realize it is my problem and not my children's. I'm the one who has to change, not the kids." AS THE DAUGHTER of an alcoholic Lynn vowed never to marry an alco-

emotionally. sexually, financially anyway you name it," she said. "I felt I deserved it. Now I know I deserve better.'

Lynn attended a group therapy session sponsored by AL-anon, a self-help group for relatives of alcoholics. "But it was not enough to help with the guilt I felt over the way I treated my son," she said. "I didn't want to take

MRS. JANSMA then pointed out that emotional abuse is treating a child as a body to be washed and fed

"I was ignoring him or venting my anger on him instead of on some kind of object like a pillow or something."

continued Lynn. "He would be doing normal things and I would react angrily." she said.

"I had a very rocky marriage, but potentially a good marriage." said Lrnn. "My husband is now a dry alcoholic, stays sober and is in Alcoholics

Anonymous.'

"I had only a negative feeling about myself," she said. "Now I have a positive feeling about myself. I changed my attitude and relationship with my mother. She was verr domineering she had to be because my father was an alcoholic and not capable at the

"I realize now that my home is not with them. I always thought it was my home. I always thought I couldn't do anything without Mom's consent.

"NOW I REALIZE and know that my home is with my husband and son. They are my family. I am also trying to build a relationship with mr father and I have set terms with my

Lynn noted that her son is behaving better and she is not reacting to him the way she did.

"He is just a typical little boy like any other child." she said. "I always thought of him as a kind of monster - as a very bad child and overactive.

But he's not. "Lately I've noted an improved reaction in him. He laughs more and is more loving. Now he wants his father around. I had been playing with him the role my mother played with meoverprotecting him because of his father's problem."

WHEN IT WAS her turn to speak Diane sat and thought a minute. Then she said "I was the black sheep of the

"I never did anything right and was always blamed for everything whether I did it or not. I was scared of my parents. especially my father, not so much my mother."

"When my Dad spanked he used a board on you.

"In the fifth and sixth grades I was sexually abused by my father." Diane continued. "It was done in a loving way on my mother's bowling night. I did it because I was afraid of my father. I later told my mother, who told me to tell Dad not to do it.

"Then I told my Dad I hated him and ran away. At 14 I got pregnant by a man I met and got married at 15. I told my father it was his fault.

"MY HUSBAND was the same thing all over again. He beat me up and told me that if I ever tried to date anyone else he would beat them up. The first time he tried to beat me up. I slapped him and he slammed me across the car."

Diane didn't feel she could run away. He would come and find her. She had no place to run.

"I physically abused my child," she

didn't want him because of his father. I couldn't do anything to his father so I took it out on him.

"I wasn't old enough to cope with a child, with his crying, no one that age is. When I couldn't take it anymore, I hid. I was scared of my husband. I stayed with my parents after I divorced my husband.

"But that was a bad situation. By then I had two kids and was vregnant again. I'was 18. My parents got mad at the kids and they had too many

WITH HER SECOND CHILD Diane swore that she would never be abusive and she never has. But when her first child went to live with his Dad for a while she began to abuse verbally her third child. By then she had married again and moved out. But it was her abuse of her third child that brought her to Parents Anonymous.

"I saw a special on TV on PA." she said. "It really got to me. I called them but was scared to death when I called. They had someone who called

"It was scary because I am afraid of people and afraid to walk into a group I didn't know and talk about

my problems.' Diane noted that the group "cared

what happened. "They wanted to help," she said. Most other people think you should

be in an insame asylum."

AND HAS THE GROUP really "It's done wonders for me." said

Mrs. Jansma indicated there had been a great improvement in Diane's appearance since her arrival in the group. She said she wished they had taken a picture of Diane before and after she came because of the obvious

Diane felt she had changed a lot since joining the group. "My biggest problem was that I let my kids run me instead of me running them." she said. "Gwen (Jansma) told me I would have to make up my mind whether they would do as I say or

Mrs. Jansma said that "every session Diane was in tears about this and we told her nothing would change until she changed.

"Then she went away for two weeks." she said. "When she came back she came in like gangbusters and said she was in charge of the kids now and they are doing this and this."

DIANE SPOKE UP. "When I told the members of the group what I had decided. everybody clapped.

She continued: "I've learned to like myself since I came here. It just occurs to me that most the girls who start in the group don't like themselves. Once you like yourself it is so much easier to like your kids"

Lynn also added a statement which summed up one of the primary aims of Parents Anonymous — to stop child

"If I ever feel abusive I can call another member of the group and I find that very helpful." she said. "By the time you hang up you are no longer angry. It can save a kid's life.

Workshop to focus on child abuse

Parents Anonymous will sponsor its third annual workshop on child abuse Saturday, Oct. 12 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Metropolitan Methodist Church, 8000 Woodward, Detroit.

Jolly K, the founder of the organization will be keynote speaker. She will also lead the morning session workshop together with Leonard Lieber, executive director of PA, who will speak on the philosophy and practice of PA.

Elly Simon, social worker and sponsor for PA, will head a discussion on the sponsor's role in PA. "How to Play with Your Child" will be a subject of a group discussion during the morning session.

Dr. Harvey Halberstadt, consulting psychiatrist for PA, will address the afternoon session on the subject "When is Consultation, Medication and Hospitalization Needed?"

Other topics to be discussed are "Crisis and Outreach" and "After Abuse -- What?"

Parents Anonymous was established four years ago in California by abusive parent, Jolly K. and her social worker. Since then it has spread nationwide, becoming established in Michigan in March, 1972. One unit meets regularly in Newburg United Methodist Church, Livonia.

The focus of PA activities is a weekly meeting. A professional sponsor. usually a social worker or psychologist, attends each meeting during which members describe their previous week's experiences.

They are praised for their successes. They are helped to understand their failures. The goal of PA is not just to eliminate child abuse, but also to develop the ability of the parent to love himself and his child.





Esch asks cut in U.S. paperwork

U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) is cosponsoring legislation to establish a commission to study the federal government paperwork burden, which is estimated to cost taxpayers \$36 billion annually.

AS A RESULT, says Esch, Ameri-

The last time federal paperwork can citizens are required to fill out was investigated was in 1942, says Esch. whose 2nd District includes Livonia and Plymouth. "Since that time. as is obvious to everyone, the amount of federal paperwork has burgeoned unbelievably - event faster than the extraordinary increase in the size of the federal bureaucracy.

"It has followed closely the 'Esch law' of expanding bureaucratic output which simply stated is: paper expands at a rate three times greater

more forms, and spend more time doing it. than any other people on

"We not only have the annual income tax form but many of us must fill out papers on an extraordinary number of other matters, including pension reporting requirements. OSHA reports, social security reporting, student assistance, and any number of other areas where we wish to engage federal assistance.

"Unfortunately, the more the federal government has become involved in our everyday lives, the more forms in triplicate have inundated us."

THIS IS especially true of small businessmen, says Esch, who must make most of the same reports "the big guys do" without the large staff to do it and without the financial re-

"It is my belief too many of these requirements are wasteful and could' be simplified. I see no reason why we have to have different forms submitted to different agencies on related matters, such as minimum wage reporting or social security."

Township cuts hospital list for emergencies

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—The fire department has reduced the number of hospitals to which its rescue units will transport emergency victims. Chief James Gignac has announced.

Several years ago the township board of trustees approved the transporting of victims needing emergency care to all hospitals within 17 miles of the township.

Gignac, in a letter to the board,

"As an administrator, I am finding it more difficult to justify committing one of the rescue squads and the manpower (to include volunteer and overtime wages) to transport to hospitals far remote from Plymouth Town-

He listed these hospitals as Beaumont, Grace, New Providence, Harper, Plymouth General, Oakwood, Martin Place West, Mount Carmel and Sinai.

"More and more." he said, "we are having multiple alarms. Transporting to the above listed hospitals entails two or more hours of service time.

"This removes from the township

\$6,000 by ordering the truck now," the chief said. "The price on this truck is being increased 10 per cent at the end of the month.' The old truck, while still usable, is



Lookout, Northwest loop! The gridders of Franklin are looking for a 73 repeat.

"Franklin simply outplayed us." said Glenn Coach Lloyd Carr."We just couldn't get field position and our defense could just hold for so long.
"We just didn't move the ball.

"I guess we'll have to regroup now and play each game as it comes up." Franklin knew its key would be in the stopping of Rocket back Fred Shoemaker and Glenn was fully aware that it would have to stop Franklin's Dan Quinn who has pound-

ed out over 100 yards a game. The Patriot defense stopped Shoemaker. Glenn failed against the 5foot-8. 155 pound Quinn.

Quinn totaled 157 yards on the ground in 24 carries and Shoemaker only 45 in 21 carries. Franklin rushed for 218 yards total

ing pass plays and Quinn this time around made food a 34 yarder and the Patriots had themselves a 3-0 lead at the half.

Franklin's Casey fumbled early in the third quarter and Glenn's Ben Grinberg recovered on his own 43. Glenn had to punt again and again Franklin fumbled.

Casey was jarred loose of the ball and Terry Johnson pounced on it for Glenn on the Franklin 28 with 5:59 left in the third quarter.

Rocket QB Johnson was hit for an eight yard loss on the first play back to the 36 and then came the play that turned things around as Rick Varterasian picked off a stray Johnson pass and dashed 60 yards down the sidelines to the Glenn 15.

Quinn followed up with a carry to the 15, to the 10, to the seven and to the one before QB Downs leaped over the Rocket line for six.

Quinn's conversion missed and with 3:16 left in the third, the Patriot margin was up to nine.

After another exchange of punts, Bob Eisiminger and Shoemaker chalked up first downs for Glenn before Johnson fumbled and Tim Hollandsworth recovered for Franklin on the Glenn 43.

With 8:06 left on the clock. Quinn went into his routine and broke six tackles for a 41 yard burst to paydirt. Quinn converted this time around and the Patriots had sealed up the Rocket

Lovich's Patriots now have Garden City East Friday night in another key Northwest battle while Carr's Rockets travel to Oak Park Friday afternoon.



Speaking of horse racing, one of the most impressive track records helongs-to Jack Riggs, who has missed only part of one day of work in 25

Riggs, resident of the Plymouth-Northville area, is the announcer for Hazel Park Race and Wolverine at DRC during their respective meets. . He also does the announcing for Northville Downs and then back again to Hazel Park Harness Raceway and DRC when they rotate meets. Besides this, he hosts a show on WWJ radio.

Once upon a time he developed a touch of laryngitis before race time (definitely detrimental to a man in his line of work). The show must go on and Riggs had always been at the controls, so what to do? Obviously a replacement; was needed, but in the meantime he struggled through six races until a replacement could be lo-cated and put before the mike.

This is the kind of dedication and responsibility toward one's work that Riggs has exhibited throughout his professional career.

JACK RIGGS "Voice Of Michigan Horse Racing"

The road to becoming Michigan's number one announcer has led Riggs to exhibiting his prowess in several other areas. He's been a placing judge. patrol judge. publicity director. admissions director, assistant racing secretary and has contributed to racing journals and magazines.

He also did national radio on the Buick Open Golf Tournament before the event was cancelled, and before leaving Miami had been the track announcer at Gulfstream Park since 1949 with the exception of some time

· off for the Korean conflict. He broadcast daily from Hialeah for many years and greyhound fans may remember him as the only man in the world to give a running description of a dog race, which lasts about 31 sec-

Riggs has called for every major network, both radio and TV. He's announced for just about every well known jockey in the U.S. and interviewed a majority of them. He's rubbed elbows with Willie Shoemaker, Eddie Arcaro and Walter Blum and called the action for thoroughbred greats like Coaltown, Kelso and Citation.

Add to this the fact that he's announced for every Detroit radio and TV station plus Chicago. New York, Miami and many other stations on the east coast and it's easy to see why many of his friends refer to him as "Mr. Perpetual Motion"

Jack's greatest satisfaction comes from knowing the job he sets out to do will be first class, and hopefully appreciated as such. A critic of his per-formance need only watch him at work, memorizing 200 horses' names and colors daily (nine or 10 in each race and therrunmemorizing them as quickly for the nest race) not to mention the constant eye on the tote board for the constantly changing

With the extension of the racing season in Michigan, Jack resigned his positions in Miami to devote full time to Michigan racing and he likes the Detroit area because "It has enabled my family to settle in one place which affords a degree of stability in a game
