Board dislikes Centennial Park survey

PLYMOUTH A survey of Centennial Educational Park students, parents and teachers shows that the high schools' modular scheduling program is more popular than ever. But some board members charged Monday that the survey reveals little about strengths and weaknesses at the schools and doesn't satisfy a board request for an evaluation.

"I take exception with this being referred to as an avaluation of the Centennial Educational Park." said board member Gary Mirto. 'My reading shows that it is not substantially different in form from what was provided last year. An attitude survey of parents, students and 66 per cent of the faculty is by no means an evaluation of the park.

The survey, prepared by Plymouth-Salem Principal Kent A. Buikema. asked random samplings of 10 per cent of the students and parents and all faculty members to respond to multiple-choice questions about the college type scheduling.

Students were asked: "Are you enjoying school more this year than you have in the past?" A total of 61 per cent of Salem and Canton freshmen said yes, while only 11 per cent answered no.

ASKED IF THEIR teachers were available to them outside of regular class time, sophomores predominantly answered yes, while freshmen were nearly equally divided.

A wide majority of teachers said that they would prefer to work with modular scheduling, although many registered neutral answers when

teacher-student relationships had improved and what effect modular scheduling had had on discipline problems. "The faculty survey shows a very

asked how teacher-administrator and

positive upward trend when compared to the 1973 survey." the report said. The percentage of respondents strongly in support of modular programs rose from 56 per cent to 77 per

The summary noted that both understanding and approval of modular

scheduling has increased among all three groups polled.

Mirto told administrators the survey offered little more than a measure of attitudes on a particular issue and could hardly serve as a guide for future planning at the park. He asked that more attention be paid to studying the performance of teachers and administrators in the two high schools, particular the new area coordinators.

"AN EVALUATION that would truly inform this board of what return it was getting on its investment involves an evaluation of performance and an evaluation of curriculum." he said. "This is an attempt to convince the board that modular scheduling is successful.

"I'm concerned about an ongoing evaluation of the park. It's a falsehood that this is an evaluation. I don't know how each area coordinator is operating in his job. There is nothing that would inform citizens in clear, demonstrable terms if these individuals are putting tax money to good use.

"We need to go into more depth," he added, saying that the "evaland generalizations.

"We need an evaluation of strengths and weaknesses. Who's telling the truth? How do you make judgments without qualitative evaluations?

"The survey tells me that ntudents like modular scheduling-big surprise! I'd fall over dead if they said they didn't like it.

"The least the board can expect is that people would be properly evaluated." he said, "rather than receive a mere baldface assertion that the purpose had been achieved.

"It's not my purpose to call principals and area coordinators here and put them on the hot seat," he said. "I'm personally aware that some significant strides have been made. That has come back to me both from parents and from the present student gov-

MIRTO EXPRESSED disappointment that only two-thirds of the faculty had responded to the survey questions.

"Why is the board not afforded the courtesy of having its professional

staff reply?" he asged."Perhaps the staff is apathetic. Many replies are categorized as 'mildly agreeing.' There's no significant movement in teachers responding to the question of improved contact between the faculty and the administration—this is not being accomplished."

According to Supt. John M. Hoben. a visit last year by a North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools accreditation team provided the high schools with a study of considerable depth.

"We have gone through a rather extensive evaluation for North Central, he said. "To this extent we've had a complete survey provided for us."

Plymouth-Canton Principal Bill Brown stressed that the document was essentially an attitude study and was not billed as a thorough evaluation of academic activities at the

"THIS IS A MERE survey and is not intended to be of lasting proportion." he said. "It helps us to sensitize ourselves to the problems againwe're not trying to give a lily-white

picture of what goes on at the park." Other board members joined Mirto in calling for a more thorough evaluation. The present situation underscores our inability to conduct any kind of evaluation." said board treasurer Thomas Yack. He suggested that the evaluation job be shared by central office personnel. "The staff at the park is burdened enough,"he added. "We need someone else to do it for

Member Mrs. Marcia Borowski asked the administration to develop a list of options from which the board could authorize formation of joint board-citizens committees to study future development of the park and possible adjustments in attendance areas in coming years.

"This is a matter of the utmost urgency and requires broad citizen participation." she said. "I don't see us appointing the same old names. We want some volunteers.

"We don't have the data we need to make the decisions we are making. We need a sophisticated evaluation tool, not some rinky-dink little sur-

"When we close the subpost on Lilly Road, it will not change the areas now patrolled by our troopers," Paul Hill. director of public affairs for the State Police, said. "The areas now covered will re-

ceive the same protection we are cur-


rently giving them," he added.

When the move is made, the townships and surrounding areas will actually have more State Police officers nearby. Not only will officers from the Plymouth subpost be stationed in the new facility, but also troopers from the present district headquarters and post at Grand River and Seven Mile in Detroit. Col. George L. Halverson, State Po-

lice director, said that after completion of the new structure. the present Detroit quarters will be continued in use as office bases for investigative and other services. The crime lab, which had been operating in a former Detroit Edison build-

Candidates oppose Ford surtax but split on economic solutions

Don't expect any support for President Ford's proposed five per cent income surtax from whoever is elected to Congress from the 2nd District

Three candidates who debated Monday night in Livonia's Bentley High School were all opposed to the anti-inflation proposal to levy the additional tax on all incomes above \$15,000. but they differed on other solutions to in-

It was the first meeting on the same platform of the three major candidates - incumbent Rep. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor), Democrat John Reuther of Ypsilanti and Human Rights Party candidate Philip Carroll of Ann Arbor. The sponsoring group. Livonia Citizens for Better Human Relations, had invited only Esch and Reuther but agreed to let Carroll appear when he showed up and asked.

ESCH, SEEKING his fifth term. favored balancing the federal budget to remove an inflation-inducing deficit. He said he voted for a \$300 billion budget ceiling but suggested it be lowered to \$295 or \$297 billion to avoid the surtax.

A problem. Esch said, is not just reducing interest rates, so that home buying might be stimulated, but rather to encourage savers to place more funds into mortgage loanmaking institutions.

Echoing Federal Trade Commission Chairman Lewis Engman. Esch cited government regulation as an inflationary pressure (by guaranteeing regulated firms a certain return on investment)

The Republican lawmaker also found fault with government regulation of the auto industry. He pointed to "unnecessary safety devices" as an example of how government intervention has an inflationary effect on an industry

REUTHER, HOWEVER, saw monetary measures as a way out of the current recession-inflation problem. He tion in Vietnam and Laos, increased called for lower interest rates and explained that this would cause increased activity in the homebuilding crease in the disability rates for inand construction industries. Spurred jured veterans.

by increased business in the construction industry, exspansionary pressures would pulse throughout the economy. causing other industries to utilize now dormant excess capacity. Not only would this be more efficient. said Reuther, it would also create jobs and boost output across the economy.

Reuther emphasized that due to high unemployment and slack in the economy. expansionary measures would not be inflationary

He also said our current economic woes are the result of external forces. such as rising oil prices and grain shortages. Reuther attributed the grain shortage to excessive export-

CARROLL, THE HRP candidate. suggested that price (but not wage) controls might be the answer to inflation. Carroll also proposed public sion upsetting most state abortion

Instead of Ford's proposed surtax of five per cent on incomes above \$15,000. Carroll called for a \$100 per cent tax of incomes above \$50,000. He called liberal Democratic proposals "Band-aid solutions."

Carroll called for a 50 per cent defense budget cut. housing programs in the suburbs to achieve a "mixture of low and middle priced housing under fair housing laws, and a guaranteed annual income.

REUTHER in his opening comments charged Esch with backing former President Nixon's social and economic policies 75 per cent of the time in the first quarter of 1974. He then accused his opponent of failing to mention that he was a Republican in much of his campaign literature.

Esch rode in on Nixon's coattails in 1972, and he ought to be man enough to ride out on Nixon'S coattails this year." said the Democratic

Esch responded that the Nixon policies he backed were worth while measures. He listed several: diplomatic action to locate men missing in acin the minimum wage, and an in-

REUTHER REPEATEDLY referred to corruption in the Nixon administration and tied Esch to 75 per cent support of Nixon's programs.

Esch charged Reuther with using the "guilt by association" tactics of the late Sen. Joseph McCarthy. Said Esch: "Let's talk issues in this campaign and rid ourselves of the guilt by association of union hall bosses."

Esch added that Martha Griffiths. retiring Democratic congressman from Detroit, also had a record of 75 per cent support of Nixon programs.

ABORTION and capital punishment were also discussed.

The candidates were asked about a proposed anti-abortion amendment to the U.S. Constitution that would overturn a recent U.S. Supreme Court deci-

Reuther was opposed to the amendment and said abortion was a woman's right.


Carroll, too, was opposed to changing the Constitution, adding that "abortion should be subsidized by the federal government."

Esch called abortion a private matter between woman and physician but called for congressional hearings on proposed abortion legislation because people are becoming "polarized" on the emotional issue.

Carroll was "absolutely opposed" to capital punishment.

Esch was generally opposed but voted for specific exceptions — kidnapers and aircraft hijackers. Reuther opposed capital punishment

because it was no deterrent to crime. All three candidates will be featured in another debate tonight at 7:45 p.m. at the Middle School West in Plymouth.



Canton may get new census next year

CANTON-A true indication of a township or city population is the number of liquor licenses allocated by the state to the area.

The licenses are based on a one to 1,500 ratio, with population counts based on the national 10-year census.

But in Michigan, there is a new law which will allow an area to take its own census with the results applying only to liquor license distribution. Canton Township is currently consid-

ering such a census. The township has used its allocation of licenses, and has more requests on file, but the population has almost doubled since the 1970 census, and is still growing.

According to Clerk John Flodin, the township is investigating the possibility of a census.

Supervisor candidate Robert Green-

stein is also in favor of the proposed census count. but feels rather than having Canton taxpayers pay for the count as currently necessitated by state law, the license applicants should share the cost

His opponent disagrees. "If you have the applicants paying for the cost of the census, then you are practically signing a contract, "says Jim

"The money we get in tax returns from the liquor licenses will outweigh the cost of the census." Poole added. Greenstein says the township should hold off its count.

House Bill 6019, introduced May 1, in Lansing would allow the census count also to be used toward tax appropriations. "It would be foolish, Greenstein says, "to take two counts within six months of each other."

Although the township is investigating the possibility of the census, actual counting would not be undertaken at least until the first of the year, Flodin said.

Red Cross supported by Community Fund

(Editor's note: The following is one of a series of articles outlining the many services offered to the Plymouth area through the efforts of the Plymouth Community Fund. This year's campaign is already under way with a record goal of \$220 set.

PLYMOUTH—If a tornado were to strike Plymouth leaving some of its residents injured or homeless, where would help come from?

Easy answer: The American Red Cross. Its emblem has become a familiar symbol of rescue and relief operations the world over.

"Disaster relief" tends to suggest a large scale explosion or earthquake, a war-time bombing raid or a train wreck, but catastrophe strikes individuals too.

Last year, Plymouth volunteers aided two families in Westland, both victims of residential fires. They met the family members' individual needs with funds for food, clothing, shelter and medical treatment.

The Red Cross has trained two disaster action teams in northwestern Wayne County,-one composed of seven Plymouth residents, covering Northville, Canton and Westland in addition to Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

"A disaster operation may involve one family or thousands," noted Judy Koteles of the Southeastern Michigan Red Cross Chapter office in Detroit.

"The common denominator is the trained disaster volunteer."

The Red Cross is authorized by Congressional Charter to assist in the event of fire, flood, hurricane or "any other situation which creates human needs that the victim cannot alleviate without assistance."

"Often Red Cross emergency aid includes the replacement of occupational tools and equipment or temporary repairs to make a home livable," Ms. Koteles says. "Disaster volunteers also advise victims where to apply for government benefits, or they may arrange for an outright gift, made possible through personal contributions to the agency.

The local Red Cross relies upon contributions made to Community Fund Drives such as the one now under way in Plymouth. But local volunteers such as the disaster action team members make these dollars go much, much further. For example:

· Approximately 30 Plymouth residents volunteered nearly 1,500 hours last year in various Red Cross programs and services, according to the Detroit chapter records. They assist on bloodmobiles, as transportation drivers, office clerks, and hospital aides. At a recent annual Red Cross recognition ceremony, Mrs. Henry Penhale of Plymouth was presented her 35-year volunteer pin in honor of

her years of dedication to the Red

• Eight active Plymouth youths volunteer alongside the adults on bloodmobile units performing a variety of "non-medical" duties. They also spend time at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia writing or reading letters for patients, running errands for doctors and nurses, and generally helping out

wherever they are needed. Approximately 80 Plymouth residents are volunteer instructors for Red Cross Safety Program courses. During the 1973-74 fiscal year, they issued nearly 30 junior and senior lifesaving cards, 516 swimming certificates and 48 cards for first aid training completed by area residents. The courses in first aid, small craft and water safety are free, and range from beginner to advanced levels.

• Finally, about 15 Plymouth busi fraternal · organizations, churches and schools hosted bloodmobile drives - some more than once during the year. "Plymouth residents have been generous in their support of the Red Cross blood program, "Ms. Koteles says. "They are regular donors as well as active volunteers on the bloodmobile units."

The Red Cross offers free classes to local people on care of the sick and injured. The volunteer nurses who teach these classes also accept disaster as-

signments.



FAITH MEADOWS

Faith works to help the blind

"They call me Mrs. Meadows instead of Faith." the 43-year old-Schoolcraft College student goodnaturedly complained, adding "I feel positiVvely ancient.

For Faith Meadows, a divorced mother of two, going back to school has been both a thrilling, and at times, frustrating experience.

She will complete her studies at the local college in August. and hopes to enter Eastern Michigan University early next year to complete work to-

ward a counseling degree. "I want to work with blind peopleto prove that they can do anything they want to do. Faith says.

The Westland resident is just the person to prove it. Faith has been blind since an accident in 1963.

Faith currently is carrying 14 credit hours, the largest load since she began taking courses at Schoolcraft. "I'm afraid to cut a class, because of the heavy schedule. I usually get a cold in the winter, but I'm hopeful it won't happen this year." Faith says.

stylus during classes. For the lectures, her tape recorder runs constantly. But for speech and sociology, she sits and punches outher notes.

She also has a reader, paid for by the state to read textbooks that Faith doesn't receive from the New Yorkbased American Society for the Blind.

The reader also reads tests and the mimeographed sheets college professors love to distribute to students. Despite the problems Faith has faced, she has a highly respectable above 3.0 grade point average.

"I love being in school, and especially having the opportunity to be at Schoolcraft," she says.

"I was just going to waste sitting at home doing nothing. Now I'm doing what I enjoy."

FAITH and her two sons moved to Westland from Detroit in 1966 because she wanted them to have to opportunity to go to Livonia schools. Her youngest son. Freddy was a baby at the time, while her older son was in grammar school

Randy, the oldest, recently started Chrysler Motor Company's Motech

"Randy calls me the scholar," Faith laughs. "He thinks its just great that I'm in school.

Despite the enthusiasm. Faith's educational endeavors are not as easy as she makes them sound.

"It's not easy being blind," she says. "We are put in a corner and expected to sit there. There are very

few professions open to blind people. "We can be secretaries, or sell pencils on the street or some other job

that doesn't require any thought. ."I can be just as productive on the assembly line at Ford's if they give me a chance.

"EVEN HERE AT SCHOOL, there are problems. When I walk down the halls between classes. I run into people. But it's because of them, not because of me.

They stop and talk in the middle of the halls. Even though I have a walking stick. I assume that they will move on when I touch them with my walking stick. But they don't and I plow into them."

Each day at Schoolcraft can pose new problems and new discoveries. The chair caddy in the hall could become a major obstacle for Faith, but she just pushes it aside

At home, she also is independent. "I can keep house, wash the windows, do the laundry and whatever else needs doing," she says . "It's all a matter of believing in vourself."







Ford 'Village Industry' was in Plymouth

Part 2 of Henry Ford and Plymouth Henry Ford's interest in Plymouth did not terminate with his abortive attempt to effect a merger between the Ford Motor Co. and the Daisy Manufacturing Co. in 1903. In the 1920s, he chose Plymouth as the location for one of the six "village industries" which he built on the banks of the Middle Rouge River.

Ford's plan involved the location of small factories on American streams within easy reach of farming districts. Operated by water power, these plants usually were built at an abandoned grist or flour mill.

These "little factories in the meadow" were an experiment in decentralization. They were the fulfillment of Ford's desire to prove the utility of water power furnished by small streams. Reared on a farm, he wanted to provide employment for farmers and their families during the winter

Ford's idea for a string of village factories came from conversations with his friend. Edison, who had unsuccessfully tried to do something similar. The theory of rural manufacturing actually was an old one. In the early 1800s Robert Owen tried it in his New Harmony. Ind., cooperative community. A similar experiment, the Brook Farm Community. established in 1841 at West Roxbury. Mass. provided Hawthorne with the background for his novel, "The Blithedale Ro-

THE LITTLE PLANTS which Ford built along the Middle Rouge were located at Northville. Waterford. Phoenix, Plymouth, Newburg and Nankin

Ford's plant at Plymouth opened in February 1923, on the site of the Wilcox Flour Mill on the Middle Rouge at Wilcox Pond. He had razed the old mill and erected in its place a small plant with 2.092 square feet of floor space. It generated 26 h.p. through its water power and cost about \$230,000 to build. By 1925 the plant was employing 31 men who made small taps for threading operations. At a later period the plant also machined parts for Ford's aircraft engine.

The superintendent of the Plymouth plant was James Gallimore, a prominent local citizen and member of the board of education. Gallimore School, opened in 1956, is named after him.

One of the hourly-rated employes at the plant was the late Karl Starkweather, the local historian. Starkweather worked for Ford for 37 years. first in the Highland Park plant.

Job referral offered to youths

PLYMOUTH - Young persons in the Plymouth, Canton, Northville area can use the services of the Plymouth Youth Center, to find jobs in the area.

The center has a job referral service to place vouths in part-time and short-term jobs.

Available primarily for 14 to 18-yearolds, the service attempts to place applicants in jobs in which they have an interest and capability.

The center will provide counseling in order to help young persons determine their abilities, and will help the two parties communicate with one another.

Counseling also will inform jobhunters about the realities of the work experience and the nature of responsibility; and will attempt to follow-up the employer-employerelationship

The Waterford plant made precision gauges. It opened in 1925. The Village of Waterford, also called Mead's Mills. was located a few miles north of Plymouth. It was established in 1827 when Dyer Ramsdell put up a mill on the Rouge. The village, once a thriving community, and a haven for slaves during the period of the Underground Railway, was abandoned after a series of fires repeatedly burned the mill down.

Ford, whose belief in the value of harnessing water power began as a youth when he built a water wheel to operate a coffee grinder, installed the



turbine at Waterford in a glass case outside of the factory for all to see.

FORD'S PLANT at Northville, the first of the village industries to be put into operation. opened in 1920 in a wood planing mill. Ford left the frame of the old mill as it stood. The plant, which made valves for Ford automobiles, soon employed more than

When the old saw mill proved to be too small. Ford had a new building constructed on the same site. As a nostalgic touch he had a mill race and an overshot water wheel made part of the modern plant.

The Ford Phoenix plant opened in 1922, a few miles south of Waterford on Northville Road, at Phoenix Lake. It had greater capacity than most of Ford's village industries, generating 100 h.p. Most of its 81 employes were unmarried women; if married, a woman could not find employment there unless her husband was unable to work.

The Phoenix plant made generator cut-outs, voltage regulators, stop-light switches and other small parts for the

electrical system of automobiles. The Newburg factory made twist drills and the Nankin Mills plant, also on the Rouge, made engravings.

All of the plants paid regular Ford wages and, from the standpoint of the employes, the village industries were probably a success. They were not a

financial success, however. The Waterford plant cost \$450.000 to construct. "a ruinous price for a tiny plant," observed Ford's biographers. Nevins and Hill.

MANY PEOPLE looked on the plants as a manifestation of Ford's preoccupation with the past.

"Henry Ford could not resist the temptation of buying the old grist mills," said one of his aides.


After Ford retired in 1945, only a few of the factories were kept in operation. Today only the Northville plant, which still makes valves, is part of the Ford operations. Most of the other little plants along the Rouge, including the one at Plymouth, are now

Henry Ford had one other tie with Plymouth, beyond his work at the Sorghum Mill in the 1890s, his negotiations with Daisy in 1903, and the village industry he established here. On the wall of his farm-office hide-out. where he could see it daily. Ford had a huge framed enlargement of the Plymouth bandwagon-a photograph taken July 1866 at the corner of Main and Penniman. (A reproduction of this photo appears on page 4 of "Pictures of Plymouth. Past and Present".) Mr. Ford said the picture reminded him of the Dearborn bandwagon in which his Uncle Henry had played.



For the new circuit court positions. three candidates received superior and endorsed ratings: Irwin H. Burdick, John J. Conley and Joseph B. · Sullivan.

Six incumbent cnadidates for nine open circuit court positions received the highest evaluation: Victor J. Baum, James N. Canham, Charles Kaufman, James Montante, John D. O'Hair and Peter Spivak.

ENDORSEDcandidates for probate court are Samuel L. Simpson, rated

superior and Y. Gladys Barsamian, rated good.

Partisan race evaluations resulted in the endorsement of incumbent State Sen. Carl D. Pursell (R-Plymouth), rated superior.

A superior rating and an endorsement was given to James R. McCartney of District 7 in the Wayne County Community College trustee

On the ballot propositions, the Urban Alliance recommends "Yes" votes on Proposition B (to provide Vietnam Veterans Bonus Bonds); Proposition C (to remove the sales tax on food and drugs) and Proposition D (to provide statewide transportation systems bonds).

Defeat was urged for Proposal A (to limit use of motor fuel tax funds).





Schoolcraft shelves food arts addition.

The Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees has temporarily delayed plans for the 7.800-square foot culinary arts addition to the Waterman Campus Center.

"Due to a computation error in the 1968 building and site fund, the \$565,800 we thought was available for the project is not." said Dr. Nelson Grote. Schoolcraft president.

He also explained that state procedures for acquiring funds, for projects such as Schoolcraft's, have recently been changed. Grote recommended the board wait and work with members of the state bureau of the budget in order not to jeopardize Schoolcraft's chances of receiving state money.

REPRESENTATIVES of Ross. Hamill. Becker and Carne, architects for the culinary arts addition, explained that building costs have increased more than \$6,000 since the original cost estimates were presented to the board last May. They also urged the board to work with state officials.

Grote's suggestion to temporarily delay plans came on the heals of a request from Gov. William G. Milli-

ken to all community college presidents to "try and show constraint in planning and fiscal management for the following year."


Grote said the governor told a meeting of community college presidents that community colleges might face a budget reduction if Proposition C (food and drug tax cut) is approved.

Trustee Paul Kadish accused the governor of using the meeting as a political forum to defeat Proposition C.

GROTE ALSO REMINDED the board of the proposal from Schoolcraft and Wayne State University to jointly assume responsibility of the Wayne County Child Development Center in Northville.
The facilities could house vocational

programs and provide extensive kitchen facilities, like the proposed addition. Crote pointed out.

The Schoolcraft-WSU proposal will be presented to the Wayne County Board of Commissioners along with eight others from local and county organizations

This is the last winter for studded tires in state

After April 1 Michigan motorists will no longer be able to use snow tires with metal studs not approved by the Department of State Highways and Transportation, according to the Automobile Club of Michigan.

Persons wishing to use the tires after April 1 can remove the studs with a pair of pliers or tire dealers will perform the job, charging \$3 to \$5 per tire.

In addition to banning studded snow tires after April 1 Public Act 138 also prohibits the uses of studded tires before Dec. 1 this year. The law does not rule out the use of tire chains or snow tires.

THE AUTO CLUB advises motorists who intend to equip their cars with studded tires this winter to plan their trips with the various state restrictions in mind.

Florida, Hawaii, Louisiana, Minnesota, MIssissippi, West Virginia and the Canadian province of Ontario prohibit the use of studs at 14 any time. .

States with no restrictions on studded tires are ALabama, Colorado, Georgia, Kentucky, Maine, Missouri, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico. North Carolina. South Carolina. South Dakota, Tennessee. Texas, Vermont, Virginia and Wyoming. District April 1. of Columbia also allows studded tires at any time.

IN CANADA, Alberta and Saskatchewan have no tire restrictions. States with time restrictions on studs are: Alaska, Sept. 15-May 1; Arizona, Oct. 1-May 1; Arkansas. Nov. 15-March 15: CAlifornia. Oct. 1-May 1; Connecticut. Oct. 15-April 15: Delaware. Oct. 15-April 15: Idaho. Oct. 1-April 15: Illinois, Nov. 15-Aril 1: Indiana. Oct. 1-May 1; Iowa. Nov. 1- April 1; Kansas. Nov. 1-April 15: Maryland. Oct. 15-April 30; Massachusetts, Nov. 2-April 30; Montana. Oct. 1-May 31.

Others are: Nebraska. Oct. 1-April 15: New Jersey, Nov. 15- April 1; New York. Oct. 15-May1: North Dakota. Oct. 15-April- 15: Ohio, Nov. 15-March

15; Oklahoma, Nov.-1-April 1; Oregon. Nov. 1- April 30; Pennsylvania, Nov. 1-April 30; Rhode Island, Oct. 31-April 1; Utah, Oct. 15-March 31; Virginia, Oct. 15-April 15; Washington, Nov. 1-April 1 and Wisconsin, Nov. 15-

British Columbia and Manitoba allow studs from Oct. 1-April 30; New Brunswick, Oct. 16-April 16; Nova Scotia, Oct. 15-April 15; Newfoundland, Nov. 1-April 30 and Prince Edward Island, Oct. 1-May 31. Quebec allows studded tires on vehicles weighing less than 5.000 pounds from Oct. 15-April 15.





Contraception is readily available to the masses these days. "but what man would subject himself to the possibility of blood clots. strokes and other side effects that women are subjected to when they take birth control pills," she said.

Male use of contraceptives is not great, she contended, because "scientists are men.

"Even sterilization is not equal." Mrs. Vukmirovich added. "Women must have the approval of the hospital board before they can be sterilized. Men can just to go a clinic and have a vasectomy."

The counselor also maintained marital problems for many women stem from their being "tired of always being the one to give." She added: "They feel their husbands are obliv-

ious to their needs. Women are the greatest consumers of tranquilizers in the country. HOWEVER, she considered the lot

of the male not much better. "They are not supposed to cry." she said. "They are not allowed to fail.

Mrs. Vukmirovich believes that marriage contracts will become more common in the future.

Milliken vs. Levin on teacher strike cures

During the past week. I had the exciting experience of sitting in with this newspaper's editorial board interviews with the two major candidates for governor in November's election.

Incumbent William Milliken was thoughtful, quiet, persuasively defending his record; challenger Sander Levin was equally thoughtful, probing, eloquently on the attack.

Coming out of these meetings, I had the over-

whelming feeling that for 1974 at least the processes of politics have thrown up to the judgement of the electorate two remarkably qualified men.

MUCH OF our conversations centered on the issue of teacher strikes, which are of particular interest to the suburbs, since the majority of teacher strikes this fall occurred in suburban districts. Both candidates had illuminating views on the subject.

Both agreed that teacher strikes hurt everybody involved. Both felt that the present collective barbaining method of resolving teacherschool board differences was at heart sound.

But both felt there was room for much improvement.

GOV. MILLIKEN approached the issue from an economic standpoint. In the case of labor-management conflict in private business, both sides have an incentive to settle: Labor does not want to give up weekly paychecks; management does not want to halt profitable operations.

But in the case of school strikes, failure to settle does not reduce the property tax millage or

state aid that the school board uses to run the system (although it might reduce the chances of voter approval of millage increases at a later date.)

Nor does a strike reduce teacher income, since state law requires 180 days of education for each student (although a strike might cut a teacher's moonlighting additional income.) He wouldn't rule out compulsory, binding arbitration.

The Governor urged attention be given to trying to construct disincentives against strikes. What these might be is vague, although some kind of reduction in teacher income after a strike of a certain duration is one approach, just as is a cut in state aid for the school board after a certain period might be another.

LEVIN CAME at the issue from another direction. He argued that it would be useful to arrange the collective bargaining situation so that the pressure of "third force" - the public at large - could usefully be brought to bear in strike threat situations

He proposed establishing a timetable for school bargaining, with the entry of a fact-finder into the process if it were running behind schedule.

To this suggestion, I would add that once injected into the bargaining process, the fact-finder should make his findings - as well as various bargaining proposals - available to the news media. Reports of the fact-finder's findings would tend to keep the public informed about the situation, and newspaper stories about various bargaining proposals would tend to reduce both sides' wildness at the table.

COMING AT the same issue - school strikes - from two different directions. our two candidates for governor have made useful and interesting proposals.

I hope that when the votes are finally counted, the occupant of the governor's chair gives them careful attention.

Schoolcraft ditch: This road hazard needs cure

Motorists driving east and west on Schoolcraft are well aware of the fact that work is progressing on the expressway. They have been aware of it for almost four years and now more than ever with truckloads of earth being moved daily.

We realize that moving earth is a dirty job, to say the least. It's even more so when clumps fall on the highway and make driving a bit slippery and hazardous, especially after rains such as those of Monday.

We also realize that the roads are swept each morning to remove as much debris as possible before the start of the morning rush. So much for that; by early afternoon the lanes are covered with layers of mud and dirt, and driving is just as bad as it was the previous day at the same time.

We don't blame the trucking companies for the conditions of the Schoolcraft lanes, but we do feel that someone from the State Highway Dept. is responsible and should do everything possible to clean up a muddled situation.

ANOTHER MATTER has come to our attention that needs action now, well in advance of the first snow, the first icy conditions and the first time drivers try to move along icy, slippery freeways.

Inasmuch as Schoolcraft highway will be depressed from Telegraph Road west to a point west of Newburg Road, that's where earth has been removed for the past several months.

In several places the digging has taken place within a few feet of the current highways. In others, the digging has been 20 to 25 feet away from the road.

It is our feeling steps should be taken at once to erect barriers along the road for the protection of drivers. Imagine, if you can, what would happen to a driver who happened to skid off the road, over the edge of the shoulder and then drop to the bottom of the huge hole where the bed of the highway will be constructed at some future date.

We aren't saying this will happen, but we are saying it could happen with a resulting loss of life and a heavy accident toll.

We well remember driving along Schoolcraft last winter on some of those slippery nights when storms came up suddenly around 9 p.m. and turned Schoolcraft into east and westbound strips of pure hell. One had to go through a couple of those nights to realize just how treacherous conditions were

Small wonder, then, that we feel barriers should be erected now along both east and west lanes and kept there until permanent guards are installed.

Sense And Nonsense

This isn't asking too much. Permanent concrete rails have been constructed along the highway between Inkster and Middle Belt Roads. But there is nothing between Beech and Inkster, nor between Telegraph and Beech.

MOVING OUT FARTHER west, the huge earth removal machines have been busy between Middle Belt and Merriman and have cleared out a very dangerous area just west of Farmington Road.

We feel sure the earth removal operations will continue as long as possible and that means bigger, wider and deeper holes. It also means more dangerous areas for drivers when the ice and snow hit.

Inasmuch as safety is being stressed everywhere these days, then it should be emphasized at the areas we have mentioned. The AAA has a motto of "bring 'em back alive" and we'd like to add a few words: "Let's keep them alive on Schoolcraft by installing safety barriers along the highway where needed. A bit of safety now may save a life this winter. Who knows? That life could be mine, yours or one of yours."

Who should pay to save farmland?

Fifteen years ago. when my family first moved from the Thumb of Michigan to Garden City, many of our communities contained farm homesteads or tracts of land suitable for farming. Livonia had Wonderland Center, a few subdivisions, but mostly large pieces of undeveloped land with a few farmers. The southwest portion of Westland (then Nankin Township) was farmland as was all of Canton Township.

Plymouth Township contained a few farms and lots of land suitable for agriculture. Redford was already a bedroom community, and the few vacant tracts left in Garden City were already doomed for either industrial or residential use.

AND SO with these recollections. I listened recently to Dale Ball speak to Schoolcraft College students as part of Futures Week.

Ball, director of the State Department of Agricultural, announced Michigan would need an additional eight million acres to cultivate by the year 2000 to feed that future population. To obtain this land, Ball proposes the state buy from farmers the development rights to their land. The land would then be zoned for agriculture, and agricultural districts "would be established. (See Page 1C in today's edition for details.)

This cost would come from the general fund because. Ball reasons, food is a basic need to all so all should help bear the expense. Fair enough - so far.

BUT THE FINANCING of Ball's proposal ought to be summarily dismissed if and when it reaches the Legislature.

Although Ball admits the possibility of a bond issue (as for clean water and recreation), he suggests the revenue could be raised by a tax on ALL real estate transactions. The tax figure

thrown in the study was four mills.

The mere removal of eight million acres from possible development for housing will make residential land scarcer and tend to increase the price of shelter. But, I will swallow this because Ball is reasonable when he suggests we all must eat

So let's take as a model a \$40,000 house in the year 2000. Because a larger percentage of the cost is for land, chances are this home is a two bedroom with basement and garage on a 40 by

100 foot lot. As residential land becomes scarcer and lot prices rise, each dollar for shelter will purchase less house.

Assume also that to buy this \$40,000 home you pay a seven per cent real estate commission and FHA points of five per cent. Your closing costs on these items alone are \$2,800 and \$2,000 respectively. Now add a four mill tax (to buy land rights for food) of \$160. Your two bedroom home will require \$4,960 cash, plus downpayment and prepaid items such as taxes and insurance.

MY POINT IS that shelter is just as basic a need as food. We shouldn't be asked to trade one for the other.

To see the difference, if eight million acres aren't acquired and that two bedroom home sells for \$30,000 in year 2000, then the commission and points would total \$3,600. This compares to a 1974 two bedroom with commission and points totalling \$2,400 with a sale price of \$20,000.

So we are talking about doubling the initial cost of acquiring shelter, discounting any changes in interest rates, property taxes or insurance costs.

We all must join with Dale Ball and land use planners in their concern that land for food be available 26 years hence. It is a serious problem. Vacant land in Livonia, Canton and Plymouth townships will soon be gone. We are restricting our choices.

The proposal is good. But we must not finance the cost of acquiring farm land at the expense of future costs to purchase shelter. Certainly, the reasonable men of today can find a better financial solution for tomorrow.

Restoring old buildings could save our cities

"Are Cities Worth Saving?" was the topic of a speech before the University Press Club given by Gerald E. Crane, chairman of Urban Planning in the College of Architecture at the University of Michigan. Dr. Crane was the architectural force behind the planning of the medical center around Harper and Grace Hospitals in Detroit.

The key point of his speech was that American cities, unlike those elsewhere in the world, are not what he called "recycling" their buildings.

IN OTHER COUNTRIES, because of the shortage of land, as a part of a city deteriorates, people come in and restore the old buildings, giving the area new life. In America we just go out and look for a new place to build in the suburbs and abandon the old buildings. Eventually they deteriorate beyond the point of restoration and are ripped down under urban renewal, to become parking lots -- and the city slowly dies.

Possibly it is the inclination of the American people to abandon and rebuild that has lead to the growth of the suburbs.

ON THE OTHER hand, you cannot have suburbs if a core city dies. Hence, there must be a commitment on somebody's part to restore the cities.

Dr. Crane gave a slide presentation of before and after shorts of what can be done in restoring older buildings. He showed how new buildings could be interspersed among older buildings on vacant lots where buildings had been ripped down, still maintaining the character of the area.





The conclusions of the speech were so obvious. We must save the cities, but because of the cost it can't be done by governmental forces. It must be done by individual citizens. Not to save the cities by restoring old buildings would be much more expensive because new cities would have to be started from scratch.

DR. CRANE was pessimistic about the short range future of our American cities, but was very optimistic about their long range possibilities.

He started work on the medical center in Detroit in 1955, almost 20 years ago, and the project is now half finished, so you see that the recycling does not happen overnight.

There are many problems of the cities that have to be solved to encourage people to go back there to live. These must be solved soon, before the cities deteriorate beyond the point of restoration.

State court outpaces U.S. court

The Michigan Supreme Court-unlike other state supreme courts— has outpaced a reluctant U.S. Supreme Court in providing important protections for the accused.according to a University of Michigan authority on criminal law.

In an address at a recent conference of Michigan judges, Prof. Yale Kamisar said landmark criminal procedure decisions of the U.S. Supreme Court under Chief Justice Earl Warren have now been undermined by recent decisions of the high court under Chief Justice Warren Burger.

But Kamisar praised the Michigan Supreme Court for maintaining the spirit of the earlier Warren Court rulings in such areas as the right to court-appointed counsel, search and seizure methods, and police line-up and identification procedures.

"IN EACH AREA-most notably in the identification cases—the Michigan Supreme Court is taking a more expansive view of the rights of the accused than is the Burger Court." said the U-M professor.

Voluntary probation tested

Manage Uctober 17, 1974

PLYMOUTH-If you're a first offender and happen to be a resident of the cities of Plymouth and Northville or the townships of Plymouth. Canton or Northville, consider yourself lucky.

The 35th District Court, which serves this area, is one of the few in the state to offer voluntary probation and a voluntary work detail for men and women over the age of 17 who commit first misdemeanor offenses.

If the volunteer serves out his or her work or probation period properly, any criminal record involved is

The programs allow the first offender to avoid the stigma which a record of conviction can bring, a mark that could dash employment opportunities or prevent military service.

THE VOLUNTARY PROBATION concept first was tried in Royal Oak in the late 1950s. Livonia and Plymouth picked up the program shortly thereafter.

The district court's probation department supervises the Plymouth-area program through offices in both the Plymouth and Northville city halls.

Most of the staff, including probation director Ken Jacobs, an area coordinator at Centenial Park, work

The voluntary work detail is a separate program which can function independently or in conjunction with the voluntary probation system.

Offenses likely to give defendants the option of voluntary work or probation include serious traffic violations, possession of small quantities of marijuana or drunk and disorderly conduct.

"The defendant, as a 'first offender,' is sentenced by the court and volunteers for the opportunity to work off his record by doing service to the community." Jacobs said. "Such a defendant pays the court \$12 per day for each eight-hour day he works. The programs are directly under the supervision of the probation department and work is done for schools, institutions, cities and townships within the jurisdiciton of this court." Work learning specialist in the Plymouth schools, carries a caseload ranging from about 15 to 20 people.

MOST WORK DETAILERS are sentenced to work several Saturdays. They have assisted in a variety of civic clean-up projects- helping out on the Rotary School Farm, school nature trails, the Plymouth Fall Festival and the Northville Oktoberfest.

Although their efforts have contributed to many successful activities. Jacobs would like to see the work, crews assigned to more constructive jobs than just litter clean-up.

munity who may need assistance or companionship.

WHILE the voluntary programs are aimed chiefly at first offenders. others are allowed to repeat if their infractions aren't too serious.

They may exercise the volunteer option again, said 35th District Court Judge Dunbar Davis. "if the crime isn't anything really repulsive. when they're not really hurting anybody." Alcoholics and marijuana offenders are among those sometimes permitted to return to the program a second or third time.

Are the voluntary measures successful? Both Davis and Jacobs think so. Shoplifters, for example, are often ef-

"It's a matter of percentages." Davis said, "but there are virtually no repeats.

Jacobs and Davis agree, however, that the work program should be expanded if it is to continue to flourish.

"We've done a lot of valid things in the community." Jacobs concluded. "but we're in need of good, valid working situations. More people need to be aware that there are a lot of worthwhile things taking place."

New American tells of his hopes

LIVONIA—The past six months have been eventful ones for Livonia resident Abraham Al-Kahl, native of Guadeloupe, French West Indies.

In January, he packed up his family and headed for the United States "to find work and give my children the opportunity for better education."

It was shortly after arriving in the United States that he became a citizen. This was possible, he explained, because "I served with the United States Army during World War II."

Al-Kahl originally came to this county in 1943 with the Free French Army in which he had served since the start of the war in Europe.

money, would have been difficult to take out of that country under the new government,' he said.

Upon receiving an honorable discharge from the U.S. Army in 1945. Al-Kahl returned to the West Indies where he married Josephine.

'My 11 children were bornthere. One of them is married and still lives there," he smiled.

Al-Kahl, 55, proudly displays his citizenship papers and his membership in the American Legion.

HE EARNED this right having fought with the French prior to joining the U.S. Army where he returned to the battle in Italy and other parts of Europe.

So concerned was he with the education of his children that before coming to this country himself, he sent some of his children to friends here. They attended the Shrine of the Little Flower Catholic High School, remaining in this country while awaiting the arrival of the rest of the family.

"It has been a rough year but interesting one. Being without work for five months is not easy but we have somehow managed," he said.

No summer dates for Northville

1975 racing dates announced

There weren't that many surprises in the announcement of the 1975 harness racing dates by Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley even though he did give the two big tracks. Wolverine Raceway and Hazel Park, their much desired back-to-back summer dates.

It was more or less taken for granted the commissioner would grant the requests for back-to-back meetings from the two major plants. The only question centered around what dates would go to Northville Downs which has had summer dates since it opened back in 1944.

Even then, if one cared to conjecture, he probably would have had to guess Northville Downs would open the year's harness racing activities on

Jan. 1 and continue for 82 nights. Thus when Commissioner Shirley did exactly that, then the next question was whether Northville Downs Executive Manager John Carlo would accept the loss of summer dates and take all of the winter programs without comment or whether he would take the commissioner to court in an effort to have the dates changed.

THE ANSWER IS that Carlo is planning a court action, one that could test the powers of the racing commissioner and one that eventually could make the legislature realize that one person with all of that authority may not be the answer.

There has been some talk of starting a movement to have the racing act changed to set up a three-man racing commission with one commissioner familiar with harness racing, one with knowledge of the thoroughbreds and the third a commissioner with some knowledge of both but a lot of know-how in the legal aspects of the racing act.

For five years, the operators of the major harness racing plants. requested back-to-back summer dates and for that same number of years the commissioner saw fit to give Northville Downs a share of the lucrative summer programs.

But he started to cut back on Northville's allotments to the point where the suburban half-mile track received only 24 nights during the summer in





Backpacking on 'the other side of the world'

By SUE ROSIEK

LIVONIA-"A lot of students will get the chance to visit Europe but not many will ever see the 'other side of

Lee spent three months, \$3,000 and traveled more than 25,000 miles assuring his sixth grade students at Monroe Elementary School in Wayne-Westland of an interesting year.

He had a great time collecting the material for his class and admits it wasn't done entirely for his students. "But being a teacher sparked the idea.'

His travels included the Hawaiian Islands of Maui, Molokai, and Hawaii, New Zealand, Australia and the Fiji

His trip began in June, four days after school was out, and ended when he flew home last week. "I have more than 300 slides of the

people, wildlife and terrain that I plan to use for a combination science-social studies program," says Lee. He traveled by plane, train, and boat and often hitchhiked, depending

on the area. In Australia, he traveled with an aborigine tribe. HIS EQUIPMENT included a 45pound backpack with tent. sleeping sleeping bag, cooking gear, one change of clothes and two cameras. Two cameras proved to be a wise decision. Lee dropped one camera when he was startled by a boa constrictor

in the Australian bush. "The wildlife in Australia was fascinating although often dangerous." he recalls.

He recounted waking up one morning while camping near Darwin, to find his tent surrounded by crocodiles. "It was an eerie feeling. The only

thing I could do was wait inside till the sun came up and the crocodiles moved on. Luckily that is what they

Lee's only weapon was a knife. First stop on his itinerary was the Hawaiian Islands.

"They are beautiful but too commercial. It's a totally unfriendly atmosphere." he says. "I was very disappointed."

Next stop, New Zealand, proved to be the friendliest and safest place he

"New Zealanders restored my faith in the human race. They were so willing to do things for a total stranger."

Lee covered the north and south islands where temperatures ranged from 50-60 degrees, and it was the winter season.

"NEW ZEALAND is predominantly a grazing country and I stayed with sheep or dairy farmers the entire month I was there. It was an interthe world." says Livonia resident and esting and totally enjoyable expe-

> "The people are very pro-American, there are no poisonous animals and the terrain resembles the best parts of the United States," explains Lee.

> "The people are still grateful for what the Americans did for them during World War II. This attitude is even promoted in the schools."

Lee visited many classrooms and was impressed with the New Zealand youngsters. "They are completely extroverted. Because of their society (slow pace and practically non-existent crime rate) the children exhibit no fear or hostility toward strangers."

"Another interesting item was the people's eating habits. It was the first time-I was ever served spaghetti on toast and baked beans with my eggs for breakfast.

AFTERWARDS Lee moved on to Australia. He traveled to Sydney where he saw the famed opera house and King's Cross Fountai, then on to Cairns and the 1,200-mile Barrier

Next Lee journeyed to Darwin. "It was a totally different world-like going back in time," says Lee.

"Kangaroos, water buffalo, crocodiles, and 10 of the world's deadliest snakes were just a few of the things I had to watch out for," says Lee. In Australia he traveled with a bush

"They live primitively, but in some ways they are more civilized than our society. They have a very strict tribal code with tremendous respect for an individual. They are constantly moving, following the game and never settling down.

WHILE SWIMMING in a river one afternoon with members of the tribe. Lee spotted crocodiles. "They assured me I could swim for at least one hour before the crocodiles attacked because they observe for a long time before they attack. I didn't stay in the water long enough to find out."

The last leg of Lee's adventure was the Fiji Islands, where he found "clear water, beautiful climate and happy-go-lucky people."

"The Fijians were exactly what I had expected but didn't find in the Hawaiians. They accepted me completely and did everything to make me feel welcome." he recalls.

"What I did and saw boggled my mind. It was much more than I expected," says Lee.



Plants' death impulse studied

Do plants commit suicide? According to a University of Michigan botanist, some do

As autumn stretches cooler weather across the country. fields of soybean. crops and wild plants are turning gold. But it isn't the cold that's killing the plants. says U-M Prof. Larry D.

The plants are killing themselves. Nooden is studying the "death signal" produced by the developing seeds in many plants.

"Gardeners and horticulturists have known about this for many years. Seed catalogs for example, tell you to pick off the faded flowers before they go to seed to produce more flowers on your garden plants." Nooden ex-

Nooden received a research grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture last summer to study the suicide phenomenon in soybeans, with the goal of increasing crop yields in the fu-

EVERY FALL, as soybean seeds mature, fields of the plant die inde-pendently of the cold weather, although an early frost could damage the plants as well. Nooden says soybeans live much longer than normal if

their pods are removed before the seeds fill out. "This is a form of suicide in plants." Nooden says. "Soybeans and other annuals go through a spectactular display of color as they die in the fall, often with whole fields turning at the same time. Soybeans may go from bright green to yellow in one week, and eventually to bare brown stem, even though the weather is favorable to growth.

The plants change color, lose their leaves and die because a signal from their seeds tells them to. With the USDA grant, we are determining exactly when the signal comes, how it's transmitted and exactly what it

THE DEATH IMPULSE is also evident in biennials and certain perennials such as the tropical century plant, according to Sue Schreyer, a botany graduate student who works with Nooden in soybean research.

flower in the second summer. After they fruit, however, they die. Since the plant has already made it through one winter, why not a second? Some hormone-like chemical from the seeds appears to limit their life."

NOODEN ESTIMATES that by successfully identifying the death hormone, it should be possible to raise soybean yields considerably.

"If we could identify the signal, we might be able to counteract the death impulse. It might be bred out of the plants altogether." he says.

Nooden and Schreyer have shown that the signals are stronger at different locations on the plant, and may not reach some parts at all. They have cultivated Y-shaped soybean plants by plucking the first formed fruits off only one side of the plant. That side, without the original seeds, is healthy while the other turns yellow and loses its leaves.

Now that you have a lot of time on your hands, why not make yourself a sun-heated hotbed. It can be made for less than \$25

A gardener tells of his solar-heated insulated greenhouse in a recent issue of Organic Gardening magazine. A solar-heated greenhouse may work fine for warm areas, but in regions where the winters are rugged, you can't count on sun's heat to do the

Ed. Romney's mini-greenhouse was 3x6 feet, by 212 feet tall. If made bigger, it would be hard to reach the plants inside, and the top door would be too heavy to open.

HE BUILT his structure out of scrap wood, and he used fiber glass insulation (either bats or roll). The top, sides and bottom are insulated. The front plastic window has a strip of polyethylene on the inside, and a layer on the outside. The air space in between makes a "dead air insulator" which keeps heat in and cold out.

A roof door is made of wood, fas-

tened together with little screws. The frame is covered with plastic on both sides and held in place with little wooden strips and nails. The whole structure is painted white and the door itself is unhinged.

It merely sits on top, held down with a looped rope. Hinging makes it difficult to get at the plants. The top can be propped open with a board or slid to one side if it gets too hot in-

A special program attraction will feature pianist Mac Frampton performing well-known show tunes.



Turf Tips, Quips

By DOC MINARD

The harness dates for 1975 have they made some additional improvebeen announced on the final day allowed by state law and now the battles are just beginning. That is, the court fights are starting, if the persons involved go ahead with their announced plans of taking Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley to court to test his powers.

The powers in this particular instance involve whether the commissioner can allot dates he considers are the best for the sport and for the state or whether he should follow tradition and date patterns set years ago and followed ever since.

The commissioner let it be known some time ago that he was considering back-to-back summer dates for the two giants. Hazel Park and Wolverine, which had requested such arrangements for the past four or five years.

But there was the question of what to do with Northville Downs, the state's pioneer of night parimutuel betting, which had enjoyed summer days since it opened in 1944.

NORTHVILLE executive director John Carlo had threatened to take the commissioner to court this year when he received only a 24-night summer season for his half-mile track. The remainder of Northville's dates were during the winter.

So there was a bit of waiting to see what would take place when the commissioner awarded the dates of April 9 through Oct. 18 to Hazel Park and Wolverine for a total of 165 nights...that took care of all of the summer and gave the big tracks the much desired back-to-back meetings.

And it also left Northville Downs with an 83-night meeting beginning Jan. 1 and continuing through April 8. And that was something Carlo didn't want even though he has the only plant completely enclosed and heated for winter races and air conditioned for the summer.

Although it appears as if Carlo is wasting his time taking the matter of racing dates to the courts in a test of the commissioner's powers, one never knows what is going to happen when the judge starts listening to the variguments. Nothing is sure even though everything points to the commissioner having the powers delegated to him by the state legislature in the racing act.

ON THE OTHER side of the issue. one is never quite certain how the members of the Michigan Harness Horsemen's Association feel about the dates. This is an organization that could wield plenty of political clout if members suddenly tell officers they don't care that much about back-toschool dates for the big tracks.

If things worked out as the commissioner and the track management believes, the state would reap the benefits of the higher mutuel handle. Hazel Park wound up its spring meeting this year with an average nightly handle of more than \$800,000 and Wolverine figures to wrap up its current fall season with an average of more than \$700,000

Then contrast that with a Northville Downs' projected average of around \$400,000 and you have part of the reason why the commissioner decided to give Northville the winter dates.

"It isn't that I didn't warn Mr. Carlo and Northville Downs that they might lose the summer dates unless





Computerizing our body history

When thinking about what medical care will be in year 2000, prophets must distinguish between what is hoped for and what may be expected.

With that qualification, Dr. Robert Douglas of Farmington spoke on "The Future of Medicine" at one of the sessions of the recent Futures Week at Schoolcraft College in Livonia.

Douglas is a medical doctor who has served as president of the Farmington Naturalist Club, is a strong supporter and leader of the Farmington Community Center, and was named man of the year in Farmington in 1973.

MEDICAL PRACTICE will be subject to federal control with regional centers being established. Douglas said. With this system, he added, "medical personnel will become responsible to government institutions rather than to an individual patient."

He commented federal control should result in equal health care for all, noting adequate health care is unavailable today in many parts of the nation.

Medical records will be computerized in year 2000. Douglas predicted, with instant retrievable capabilities of a patient's medical history. Thus, a Detroit resident in an accident in Arkansas can be assured of a rapid transmissal of his medical background before surgery is performed.

OTHER PROSPECTS between now and year 2000 include:

Automated laboratory testing increasing in scope to improve diagnostic skills:

Medical training improvements at all levels — students will proceed at their own pace rather than at an arbitrary schedule of four years college, four years medical schools and four years residency;

It will be possible to predict the statistical likelihood of an individual developing a disease determined by heredity and to determine at what age the disease will occur;

Environmental visual factors can also be programmed to predict certain other diseases and at what age they will strike.

In the area of transplants. Douglas predicted a trend toward use of synethic materials in lieu of human or animal transplants.

Douglas anticipates there will be transplants of about every human organ except for the brain. These implants would include an artifical pancreas, cornea, "wearable, moveable artifical kidney," artifical muscles and blood.

DOUGLAS CONTINUED prognosticating by indicating there will be a new variety of antibiotic drugs in year 2000 to combat infections and viruses.

There will be new micro-organisms resistant to the new drugs of today. he explained, just as many of today's bacteria are resistent to penicillin. "Whatever drug is effective in year 2000 will be ineffective 25 years later, that we can be sure of."

Other predictions by Douglas were: Treatment of cancer will improve but a single cure won't be found. "Cancer is a variety of diseases with different causes. I forsee some undramatic breakthroughs with the fight against cancer being a series of unspectular findings."

There will be an increased realization of the importance of nutrition. "The interests of the medical nutritionists must overcome the interests of food producers if public health goals are to be met."

Nuclear medicine will probably supplant radiology in the area of diagnostic services, he continued.

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) units, similar to those now in Southfield and Detroit, will be more available in all communities.

In psychology, significant gains will be made in the field of animal psychology and its human implications. Especially important will be the significance of "imprinting" — the effect of the first few hours, days and weeks of

schizophrenia will probably be found to be caused by an enzematic defect in the brain, he continued, and controlled by chemical injection

controlled by chemical injection.

The major health problem in the U.S. today is the automobile. Douglas stated, causing 56,000 deaths a year. An alternative means of transportation must and will be found, he added.

PRUDENCE IN ethical, moral and spiritual issues must be exercised and the issues cannot be answered by doctors alone, he cautioned.

"It is not the physician's job to determine when life should terminate, such as in the case of an elderly person who has had a massive stroke with no chance of recovery.

"We are all fated to die sooner or later. What's important isn't the number of years lived but how you use those years in social and thoughtful pursuits. The provision of useful services is much more productive than the mere production or aquisition of material wealth."

POLLUTION SOLUTIONS:

The answers are in our heads

The solutions to pollution are all in your head.

That's the message Merle J. Richmond delivered Wednesday to the Schoolcraft Community College Futures Week group meeting on "Ecology and the Survival of the Human Species"

"I don't have any answers" to the problems of pollution, Mrs. Richmond said, "but it does come down to each one of us."

POLLUTION—the myriad problems caused by upsetting the delicate balance of nature—is man's peculiar contribution

Mrs. Richmond traced the beginnings of pollution back to when man captured fire, long before history was recorded. He used the fire to burn down woods which harbored animals, forcing them into traps. The impact was not great, but the destruction was the beginning of man's upset of the eco-system.

An eco-system is a unit in nature which is self-sufficient when supplied with a source of energy such as the sun. This self-sufficiency implies that whatever changes occur do not get out of hand. There is a balance.

AS CULTURE BEGAN to accumulate and man's technology increased with his brainpower, he made greater and greater demands on his environment, Mrs. Richmond explained.

Ultimately, societies became less mobile and required more territory for their endeavors. They became hostile and armies were developed to ravage the land. "The armies then were an extension of political, economic and land use policies—just as they are today," Mrs. Richmond said.

As the world's population increased so did ecological problems. Nature could not accommodate the staggering demands man made on it.

Mrs. Richmond pointed out that while it took more than 9.000 years for the population to increase from 10 million persons to one billion, the second billion took only 92 years; the third took 18 years, and the four billion mark was reached in only four years.

TODAY ONE SPECIES becomes extinct each year, probably because of the pressures put on nature by man, Mrs. Richmon said.

Our rapidly expanding technology cranks out inventions which could ultimately destroy us too. she added.

DDT. as an example, is dumped in the waterways and makes its way up through the food chain to predatory birds. The DDT interferes with the birds' reproductive systems, decreasing the population of a necessary part of the eco-system.

More to the point, DDT makes its way into women's bodies and makes mother's milk unacceptable for consumption according to government standards, Mrs. Richmond said.

Aerosals and supersonic transports also contribute to the destruction of the earth's eco-system by chemically reducing the atmosphere's natural sun filter, she said.

BEYOND POPULATION and technology as specific problems. Mrs. Richmond said man's attitude and ignorance contribute significantly to the predicament.

Delving into history. Mrs. Richmond said "man has always thought he was the controller of the creative world rather than dependent on it...We don't accept that we are part of nature."

Nor does man know the impact his demands have on nature, she said.

WHAT MUST be done?

An integrated environmental science must be developed where man is


ence must be developed where man is included as part of the eco-system. Mrs. Richmond said.

"We must also rethink our philosophy of living. More science and more

technology will not get us out of the present crisis."

The educational system must also be re-adjusted to reflect a unified philosophy, she suggested. As education once centered around religion or technology, survival now might be appro-

Finally, there must be population control, she concluded, so that the tilted eco-system does not fall completely off-balance.

Fated to starve? 4 million acres needed to feed state's population in year 2000

Some four million acres in Michigan must be diverted to agricultural production by year 2000 to maintain adequate food supply for state residents 26 years from now.

That's one of the projections presented to Schoolcraft College students in Livonia during Futures Week by Dale Ball, director of the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

Ball has been with the department since 1951, has been director since 1965, and before that was with the soil conservation services of the U.S. Agricultural Department. Besides his state office. Ball is also a dairy farmer in Michigan.

ABOUT TWO YEARS ago, the state agricultural department began talking seriously about land in Michigan in terms of land needed to feed the state's future population, Ball began.

"Does Michigan need its agricultural industry or can it rely on another state to feed our people? Can we become just an industrial state?"

In answering his own question, Ball pointed out that last year agriculture accounted for \$4 billion income — some \$1.4 billion earned by farmers and the remainder by food processors and producers.

Agriculture accounts for about 25 per cent of all jobs in the state (with five per cent of that being jobs on the farm). Ball continued. In fact. Ball maintained, agriculture is second to the automobile industry in Michigan in terms of total income. "But in terms of values, agriculture is number one because not very many have ever eaten an automobile."

IN LOOKING towards the future. Ball cited present trends in Michigan farming from 1962-72.

During this decade, food production per acre only increased by an average of nine-tenths of one per cent each year. But because of land being removed from production, he cautioned, there hasn't been any increase in total crop output.

An alternative might be to look to other states to produce Michigan's

food. But this is unlikely, Ball says, because states in the Great Lakes area are losing land faster than Michigan, the West has plenty of land but not enough water, and in the corn belt all available agricultural land is already in cultivation.

Michigan can convert enough land to agriculture to meet future needs, Ball reports, without jeopardizing industry, business or residential construction.

This conclusion is based on department assumptions that the state will continue to raise enough food to feed half its population (as it does now), that the same standard of living and diet will be maintained, that there will be no major war, and that in year 2000 Michigan's population will be 12 million — based on a birth rate of 1.8 per female.

If the above assumptions are met. Ball continued, Michigan must put eight million acres into food production by year 2000. This compares to 6.5 million acres in production in 1972—a year when 750,000 acres were being held in reserves.

It may be undesirable to use forest lands for agricultural, he admits. "But when the day arrives in the future that food becomes a higher priority than fiber, then we could clear that land."

The Michigan Department of Natu-

ral Resources projects 12 million acres of agricultural land will be needed by year 2000. That much land could be made available. Ball says. but "would mean removal of more timber than we desire."

Ball suggested offhand that a future

alternative might be to cultivate 12 million acres, use crops from eight million acres for Michigan residents, and the other four million acres to sell food to other nations to buy oil and other scare products.

A CONCEPT has been developed by the agricultural department which would allow the state to obtain eight million acres for cultivation. The concept includes separating de-

velopment rights from the title of agri-

cultural land, just as is done now for mineral and water rights and in granting of utility easements.

"The state would acquire these pights on behalf of all its citizens, for the purpose of insuring future availability of food production land resources.

"The cost could be met by funds derived from the sale of bonds, although alternative funding sources such as taxes on real estate transfers are possible."

Under the proposal, lands from which development rights were separated would be assessed for taxes only for that permitted use — thus eliminating tax assessment of croplands on the basis of nearby developments or speculation, which are forces often working to encourage the farmer to sell for non-agricultural uses.

An agricultural district (AD) would be created by farmers within each township, based on local initiative. Once 80 per cent of the farmers in a district agreed to participate, land in the other 20 per cent would be acquired by power of eminent domain.

Outright purchase of the eight million agree by the second process.

lion acres by the state must be rejected. Ball adds, because at an average of \$500 per acre the bill would total about \$4 billion.

If purchasing the development

rights is financed by a real estate tax. Ball's proposal is a four-mill tax on real estate sales. Thus, any real estate sale would be taxed with revenue going into a special fund earmarked to buy agricultural development rights.

Once the farmer sells his development rights, conversion of the land to other uses wouldn't be allowed. Owners would receive a one-time payment for the development rights to their land.

The payment would be the difference between the assessed value for farming and the current market value for any other use permitted by existing zoning or land use restraints. "This mechanism should reduce the

checkerboarding effect of speculatorheld tracts in land development."

Ball stresses the proposals are only in the concept stage. Legislation hasn't been introduced or even considered yet. But planners are looking 26 years into the future to determine in advance how to feed our population then.

Disappointed that repeated efforts. to cooperate with other community colleges in Wayne County in charting future growth haven't been entirely successful. the Henry Ford Community College board of trustees has decided to make another attempt.

The board passed a resolution authorizing its chairman. James G. Buick, and college president Stuard M. Bundy to contact "appropriate persons and agencies" to attend a meeting "which will provide a broader forum for the implementation of the policy of regional cooperation in southeastern Michigan."

BUNDY NOTED that officials of Schoolcraft Community College in Livonia have also taken action to encourage cooperation between community colleges in Wayne County to avoid duplication of services and "raids" on each other's enrollments.

The Schoolcraft board last week met jointly with the State Board for Public Junior and Community Colleges to discuss regional cooperation in an open study session.

Schoolcraft's position is that it would be better to coordinate on a regional basis (southeastern Michigan) than merely on a Wayne County

John Ryan, a Westland attorney and trustee of Wayne County Community College, has also issued a plea for cooperation between community colleges in Wayne County. He noted a trend has developed for Wayne County Community College to be allocated the black students with Schoolcraft and others having white enrollments. Ryan said this is a most unfortunte trend and should be stopped.

IN DISCUSSING the matter with the board Sept. 14. Bundy listed eight actions taken since August, 1972, by the HFCC board — all intended to support regional cooperation among area community colleges.

The latest was the July 8 action by the board, expressing disappointment at the lack of coordination with WCCC which this year leased a former high school building as a regional campus. The unit, the former Rosary High School, is four-tenths of a mile from the Dearborn city limits.

Ryan has also expressed concern about Schoolcraft's satellite campus in Garden City encroaching on WCCC's enrollment territory.

The HFCC board last July authorized Buick to write the WCCC board chairman about Henry Ford's disappointment at lack of coordination and requested a reply by August. To date, there has been no reply of any

Henry Ford is the largest of the four community colleges in the state's most populous county. Besides School-craft. HFCC, and WCCC, there is Highland Park College.

Bikeway funding approved

More than \$1 million has been approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for nine bikeway projects in Michigan.

Of the approved funding \$819,000 will be spent for a system of bikeways in Detroit. Ann Arbor. Wayne County and Trenton.

The FHWA approved an allocation of \$1,079,000 to be used for the Michigan bikeway projects during the current fiscal year which began last July

The approval does not grant Michigan extra money for bikeways, but merely permits the state to use the \$1 million from highway funds for bike-

THE MICHIGAN bikeway allocation as made under provisions of the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973, which authorized, for the first time, a maximum annual expenditure of \$40 million nationwide for bike and pedestrian paths in any one fiscal year.

Engineering and technical assistance in planning and constructing local bikeways will be available through the Department of State Highwavs and Transportation in Lansing.

All nine proposed projects under the federal allocation are in addition to 24 other bikeway projects, totaling nearly \$2 million, previously announced under the State Highway Commission's bikeway program.

The commission's proposed \$1.1 billion bonding program, scheduled for referendum in the Nov. 5 election. also calls for expenditures up to \$25 million for a statewide network of bikeways and non-motorized transportation paths.

Ford bill has hearing

Congressman William D. Ford (D-15) will participate in hearings Friday, Oct.18 on proposed legislation aimed at eliminating unemployment and other economic impacts of plant closings. The hearing will begin at 10 a.m. in the main auditorium of the City-County Building in Detroit. Congressman John Dent (D-Pa) will chair the meeting.

Ford and Minnesota Democrat Sen. Walter Mondale, who will also attend the hearing, are principal sponsors of the bill.

The Ford-Mondale Bill, officially termed the National Employment priorities Act of 1974, amends the Fair Labor Standards Act by requiring advance notification to affected employes and communities of proposed closing or relocation of industrial, business or agricultural concerns.

It also provides assistance, including job training to workers who become unemployed by closings and assistance to companies considering dislocation and to communities which are affected.

In addition the bill prevents federal benefits and support to firms which close or move plants without justifica-

Research, development 5); key to energy security

By IRVING W. ROZIAN What is our best course of action toward energy independence and a return to inflation rates of four or five per cent instead of 12?

In short term economic maneuvering, we can withhold grain, as President Ford has begun to do. We should continue to support Israel, with a compromise peace settlement as an incentive to Arab moderation. Abandonment of Israel would not lower oil prices.

Heavy dependence of the western nations and Japan on oil imports created a seller's market subject to monopoly control. Economic advisors also counseled the oil producing states to look to their own futures. 25 or more years from now, when their oil might be gone or high in price compared to nuclear power. The time was ripe, from their point of view, for a sharp increase in oil prices. The war merely provided an excuse.

WE CAN REDUCE our dollar outflow somewhat by conservation measures aimed at halting our annual five per cent growth of energy comsumption. Any effort to actually cut consumption by five per cent or more would probably precipitate a severe depression.

We can permit prices of domestically produced oil and gas to rise and eliminate quotas as an incentive to exploration and marginal production from old fields by secondary and tertiary recovery methods. This has the undesirable effects of further raising the consumer price of our mix of domestic and imported oil, and hastening the depletion of our own reserves.

The only promising mid-range solution is a technological one. It is a crash program of research, development and installation of ener

servation equipment.

For the United States, this means the conversion of some of our large coal reserves into synthetic natural gas. gasoline and middle distillates for diesel fuel and heating oil. These conversion plants will look like a cross between a steel mill and an oil refinery

U.S. Energy Administrator Sawhill will propose to Congress a five-year expenditure of \$11 billion for research and development in energy sources. conversion and conservation. One billion of this is for long-range, fuel-free sources such as solar and wind power.

The reason for not placing higher priority on these seemingly free sources is the excessively high cost of collecting them. Even at the most promising places on Earth, the sun delivers less than one horsepower (roughly three-fourths of a killowatt) per square yard of collector, and the wind only one-tenth as much.

THE \$11 BILLION is only a drop in the bucket compared to the necessary construction cost of coal mines, transportation facilities. and conversion plants. Moreover, we cannot afford to wait for the results of a five-year R and D program.

We must begin design and construction immediately, improving our knowledge as we go along. Fortunately, much of the coal conversion

technology has already been developed by our own Bureau of Mines and by England and Germany. We have known basically how to do it since World War II. but the economic incentive was lacking while oil and gas were cheap. Significant production could begin in 3 years.

The high capital cost of conversion plants, combined with the high and unstable interest rates and huge capital outflow engendered by the oil price escalation itself, are making private investors hesitant about committing the better part of \$100 billion probably needed over a five-year period.

This is particularly true since the oil producing states could drop the world price to half its current level. or below, without seriously hurting their development plans. This might wipe out the return on investment in many conversion ventures.

There is a real cost in energy (as much as 25 to 50 per cent) for conversion from one chemical form to another. In addition to the higher primary energy cost of coal there are also plant cost and the cost of environmental restoration following strip mining or tailings disposal from shaft mines. Yet we build navies, which cost more and produce nothing, for the sake of our freedom and independence of foreign policy.

AS THE WRITER stated at the Conference, this capital risk will have to be underwritten by the government.

For the end production of synthetic fuel, it does not matter much whether this is done by federal government construction of facilities, direct subsidy, risk insurance, or letting U.S.based international oil companies retain their share of the escalated prices, on condition of supervised reinvestment in alternate fuels. Antimonopoly worries may have to give way to expediency and experience for

We could even let the OPEC (petroleum exporting) countries build and own the conversion plants with their surplus dollars. This would be particularly appropriate if their motives are really to relieve the drain on their finite oil reserves. Of course, the facilities would have to be built in the consuming countries, and the governments of those countries should insist upon control of production and pricing, plus the right of confiscation of foreign assets. After all, turn about is

Personally, I prefer the route of government regulated and insured private investment. Socialism is merely monopoly capitalism carried to its ultimate, with the same evils of authoritarian rule and bureaucratic in-

Whatever course we take to energy independence, we must take it quickly and decisively, or face economic disaster. The program should be given near-wartime priority.

Among other considerations, we must be selective about federal projects to relieve short-term unemployment. Even if it means moving people from their present homes, idle labor must be employed in mining, transportation, and conversion plant construction. We cannot afford the double cost of misdirected labor and misspent energy associated with make-work projects. recreational area improvements, and other non-essentials, until we are back in equilibrium again.

WE MUST recognize world energy interdependence in four ways: 1. Share technology and devel-

epment costs with other nations in the same bind that we are. 2. Slowly build up a consuming countries' oil reserve of at least six months as a cushion against further

3. Give fuel and monetary assistance to developing countries even harder hit by the price rise.

4. Use diplomacy and economic rationality to urge upon the OPEC countries an advance price reduction to about \$7 per barrel, which should be a little over the equivalent price of crude for synthetic petroleum products. The incentive would be pre-served without such crucial effects on the world economy.

heating oil, and synthetic natural gas. The challenge comes from large local consumption and the dependence of the auto industry on reasonably priced motor fuel. The opportunity comes from the existence of the steel industry and the conditions which caused it to develop here.

Our waterways provide the world's cheapest transportation of solid materials. They link nearby deposits of steam and coking coals, iron ore, and limestone. The lakes and rivers themselves provide unlimited supplies of process and cooling water (which can be kept clean and recycled to protect the environment).

In future years we may be grateful that an artificial crisis focused our attention, in time, on the need to be less prodigal and more far-sighted in the use of Earth's 'resources. The developments of science have made possible a stable, healthy, and rewarding future for America and the world. We are just going to have to make an extra effort to get there from here.
