City wants 30-acre parking lot

Arguments heard on annexation

PLYMOUTH—Plymouth Township officials and residents turned out in strength Tuesday night in Middle School East to ask the State Boundary Commission to refuse the city's bid to annex the Burroughs parking lot on Plymouth Road.

About 70 people, mostly township residents, heard city and township officials debate the merits of annexation before four members of the state commission.

The public hearing, required by state law, precedes a decision likely to come after the first of the year on whether the 40-acre parcel should become part of the city.

ACCORDING to City Manager Fred L. Yockey, the economic strength of the city is of concern to all residents of the Plymouth community.

'I'm speaking on behalf of the area." he said. "What we do is going to be done for the area for the future." He cited other areas where several cities have developed side by side, duplicating services that a single unit of government could more efficiently provide.

The people in Plymouth still have an opportunity to find a way to consolidate the efforts of the Plymouth community. But until we can find a way to survive as a community. such things as streets, police, parks and

the cultural centers are all reasons why the city needs some form of added taxation, some form of valuation that will give us time until we can find a way.

"What we need is additional space in the city to provide the services everyone enjoys. If we don't the community is going to suffer in the long

NOTING THE continuing constitutional question of the boundary commission's authority to decide annexation matters. Township Attorney Don Morgan asked the commissioners to turn down the city's petition. "The response of the township and

of the dominant property owner. Burroughs Corp., is a resounding 'no," Morgan said. "The burden of proof is on the petitioner (the city). Nothing in the statutes or in case law favors one party coming into the hearing. A change of the status quo rests with the petitioner—that means proving not just what he desires, but what is fact,"

According to Morgan, the city's con-

tention that approval of the annexation would "straighten the city's boundaries" is false.

"The logical conclusion of 'straight' in the city's terminology is adding more right angles," he said. He took issue with a claim by the city that it was the center of "socioeconomic" activity for whatever development eventually took place on the

site. The property was zoned last year

by the township to allow mid-rise commercial and residential development. such as apartments and a shopping

He argued that Hines Park and the Middle Rouge River created a natural eastern boundary for the city.

Morgan reminded the commission that a consolidation election held in May had been decisively defeated by

Both the Rocks of Plymouth-Salem and the Chiefs of Phymouth-Canton can guarantee themselves no worse than a share of their respective league championships by winning Friday and Saturday

Coach Tom Moshimer took over the Rock belm eight years ago after his teams at Dundee had won 33 in a row, and the Rocks' performances of '73 and '74 have been reminiscent of that string. Only Edsel Ford and Trenton beat Salem last year, and both of those losses already have been avenged as the Rocks have marched to six straight this season.

The Rocks have brilliant leadership in co-captains Scott Agnew and Tim Dillon, who also are outstanding at their own positions - Agnew at fullback and linebacker and Dillon as a master of the option play's pitchout timing from his key quarterback role in Moshimer's wishbone offense.

Prisoners get new lease on life with training

The first nurse assistant training program for women prisoners of the Detroit House of Correction (DeHoCo) completed earlier this year was a unique experiment in rehabilitation. Nothing quite like it had been done before. Particularly unusual ts the combination of institutions working together to make it possible-Schoolcraft College furnishing the curriculum and teaching staff, the Plymouth Center opening its wards for on the job training. DeHoCo cooperating with woman power and supervisors, and the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration which came through with a grant from the State Office of Criminal Justice

AT THE TIME the first 18 women received their diplomas the long term benefits of the 22 week training program were still to be determined.

The short term benefits were obvious. The women-trainees had gained self-confidence and hope for a new and better life after their release. They had marketable skills and all had passed the state and national civil service exams.

The center's residents, who are severely mentally or physically handicapped, had blossomed under the additional attention and care which the trainees brought to the regular program.

Now, with the second session just completed, and 16 more women prepared to handle the demanding duties of a nurse assistant, the lasting values are beginning to be evident.

Program director Mrs. Pat Gugel. who took over when former director Don Laird left to join the Olivet College faculty, knows of eight from the first class who have good jobs in the field. Not all in the first class have been released, several joined the second class for advance training.

Several in the first class returned to their families to take care of their own children. Mrs. Gugel says the eight now holding jobs are making between \$2.50 and \$3.50 an hour working in convalescent homes, state mental hospitals, nursing homes and one is with a VA hospital.

Mondale hits Ford 'turkey'

LIVONIA-Sen. Walter Mondale (D-Minn.) told a group of 100 senior citizens Friday that President Gerald Ford has "served the American people a turkey-not a marshmallow-and the turkey must have slipped past the Wholesome Act. because it stinks."

Mondale joined Michigan Democratic candidates including Sander Levin. John Reuther and William Joyner at Livonia's senior citizens building, Farmington and Five Mile roads.

Mondale and Reuther, 2nd congressional district candidate, assailed the Republican administration for allegedly favoring big business rather than "middle Americans.

"MONOPOLISTIC OIL companies are ripping the country off." said Mondale, claiming that members of the administration are "too close to the powers of big business."

Reuther's speech was in the same vein, sharply critical of attempts to deregulate the oil and natural gas industries.

"If our government enforced antitrust regulations, it could save \$90 billion," said Reuther. "When the demand for cars went down, prices didn't go down," he said, inferring that the administration was to blame

"Let's bear the burden equally." said Reuther, who charged his incumbent Republican opponent Marvin Esch with "fighting for weak public service programs."

LEVIN, Democratic candidate for governor, said "Michigan has been hurt more than any other state by unemployment," and reminded his audience that "senior ditizens may get a 150 buck rebate but pay out 200 bucks in increased property taxes."

All three speakers criticized corporations which close down plants and abandon the state.

"An employer must be concerned first with notifying his employees, and be concerned with employee welfare first," said Mondale, often mentioned as a presidential contender.

"Deregulation of the oil and gas industries provided \$24 billion in relief for the energy business, which is already enjoying profits, yet the administration has provided only \$18 in tax relief for Americans earning \$10,000."-Sen. Walter Mondale.

she gets out." She mentions one, a lifer, who has been granted an appeal for a new trial. "Her potential for employment will be a big plus and probably help her get out earlier

THE TRAINEES who completed the course spent 18 weeks with time divided between classes and working on various wards of the Plymouth Cen-

Always at the beginning some of the women come to Mrs. Gugel to say they just can't face working on the wards. The severity of the disabilities seems more than they can cope with.

Mrs. Gugel says her usual comment is: "Just try it for one more day, these children need you so badly."

And so they continue, one day at a time, watching the painfully slow prog-ress the residents make. Gradually they become attached to the patients and the response from both trainee and child deepens and grows into a caring relationship.

They begin to see each person on the wards as an individual with a special personality, special needs and special potential Mrs. Gugel tells of one of her assist-

ants who worked with a boy in a wheel chair who could hardly raise his head from his chest. The assistant discovered an interest in music in her young charge and before she left, he had started to play

SHE RECALLS the day not long ago when the trainees visited a community nursery school and spent the morning watching and playing with bouncy, lovely, normal children.

Board will vote on \$15 million school budget

PLYMOUTH-Following a public hearing Monday at 7 p.m. in the Plymouth-Canton High School Little Theater, the board of education is expected to vote on adoption of a proposed school operating budget of nearly \$15 million for the 1974-75 school year.

: The proposed budget represents an increase of \$1,806,725, or 13.7 per cent. over last year's total of \$13,171,275.

About \$10 million, by far the biggest chunk, would be allocated for teacher salaries, compared to \$8.6 million last year, an increase of about 16.3 per

Non-instructional salaries, the second largest item in the budget, are slated to rise more than 10 per cent. from \$1.9 to \$2.1 million. The total district payroll would top \$12.2 million. an increase of 15.2 per cent over last year's \$10.6 million.

SALARIES and fringe benefits for all employes total 85.7 per cent of the proposed budget. Other significant expenses include heat and utility bills. \$545,300; instructional materials. \$271,485; textbooks and workbooks. \$115,660; library supplies, \$84,020; interest on tax note. \$146,000; bus replacements, \$130,000; and other expenses. \$851,547.

All categories registered slight increases over last year's totals, with the miscellaneous expenses rising 5.7

Instructional costs - salaries for teachers only and supplies - account for 71.2 per cent of the expenditures projected for the new budget, with maintenance operations taking 14.2 per cent. About 3.2 per cent of the new \$15 million budget would be spent for administration.

In 1964-65 the schools enrolled 6,192 students on a budget of nearly \$3 million. This year's student body of 12,636 will be educated at an estimated cost of nearly \$15 million.

According to the budget review submitted to board members at a worksession Monday night, several factors have combined to force the price of education up over last year.

Among them: an additional enrollment of 780 students, supply, service and equipment price hikes, the opening of East Elementary School, staff salary hikes, a larger faculty (570 teachers compared to 535 last year) and the support of continuing programs and innovations.

Organizations to which the schools contribute include the Plymouth-Canton Development Commission, the Junior Athletic Association, the Community Arts Council and the Plymouth-Canton Recreation Authority. The district also provides vocational classes for inmates in the Detroit House of

Among school programs to be funded in the 1974-75 budget are substitute teachers, \$100,000; athletics, \$130,000; data processing, \$85,640 vocational education (not including salaries), \$60,950; and district crossing

In past years the cost of crossing guards has been shared by the three governmental units whose residents are served - the City of Plymouth. Plymouth Township and Canton Township. Last year. however. Plymouth Township refused to pay. Although all three were billed this year, only Canton has paid its share so far.

Local taxes provide the bulk of the district's revenue, providing 77.3 per cent of its anticipated funds or more than \$11.5 million.

State aid provides \$3.1 million, or 21.1 per cent of the budget. The federal government adds \$138,000 (mostly in Title I funds for the PLUS program for disadvantaged preschoolers) and the county intermediate district is expected to allocate \$100,000 from revenue from its newly-approved special education millage

The district's state equalized valuation (SEV) kept pace with the increased expenditures, climbing 13.7 per cent in the past year, from \$346.5 million to \$394.2 million. Local tax revenues will increase proportionately. from about \$9.9 million in 1973-74 to \$11.2 million this year. The SEV has nearly quadrupled in the last decade.

State aid is expected to be up only 7.7 per cent over last year, increasing the schools total revenues 13.1 per cent; compared to the 13.7 per cent rise in expenditures. In addition to other revenue sources, the district listed a beginning cash balance of

City looks to township to share traffic light costs

PLYMOUTH-Although under no legal obligation to do so, the city commission unanimously authorized sharing the cost of installation of a traffic signal at the Brookside- Hartsough and Sheldon Road intersection.

City Manager Fred Yockey was also authorized to write a letter to Plymouth Township, requesting the township to share in the estimated \$1.470 cost to the city.

The Wayne County Road Commission will pick up the remainder of the estimated \$5,860 cost of the light.
"The township will benefit as much

as will the city residents when the light is installed," said Commissioner Joseph Bida. "They should be requested to share in the cost."

Although neither body has any obligation to share any cost of the light installation, the commission indicated its concern by its action.

Whether or not the township will share in the cost, the city's resolution authorizes its financial participation in the project.

Hartsough is a city street while Sheldon Road is a county maintained

The county road commission will do the installation work, and billing will be based on actual cost. The road commission will also assume the costs of electricity and maintenance

In other action Monday, the commission adopted by reference at its first reading, an amendment to chapter 98 of the Title VIII. General Building Regulations of the city building code.

The move brings the city code into conformity with the Building Officials Conference of America (BOCA) code. In essence, the commission's action was required by state law which says a municipality must adopt a uniform building code in an attempt to stand-

ing to an amendment to the city code nance, had there been one. dealing with illegally drawn or issued checks.

The amendment incorporates "bad check complaints" into the city code "to provide a more efficient, effective and local method" of handling com-plaints, according to Plymouth Police Chief Timothy Ford.

A proposed amendment to the city's zoning ordinance which would require provision of rights-of-way for firefighting and other emergency vehicles based upon the recommendation of the city fire chief will be discussed at a public hearing Nov. 18.

The chief will recommend when the rights-of-way will be essential for safety purposes and the location and width of the rights-of-way.

The public hearing will be held in the commission chamber of city hall at 7:30 p.m.

Mullins was a 1970 graduate of Livonia Bentley High School. He had · started working recently for the Ford Motor Company in the Dearborn automotive assembly plant office.

Previously he was employed by Joshua Doore furniture stores as a salesman. He met Maureen while working for the company.

Someday he wanted to be a model and had grown a mustache which he thought was too blond and so he dyed

Miss McMahon was a 1971 graduate of Livonia Churchill High School where she was active in student government and the pep club. A Churchill -counselor had written that "Maureen not along well with all kinds of people

and was well like by her peers." Many of them came to the funeral at St. Paul of the Cross Monastery.

Mullins also was well liked. The funeral procession from the Manns-Ferguson Funeral home Tuesday was half-a-mile long, and included friends from high school, and his work, according to Mullins' sister, Mrs. Laura

And if Scott Shrager of Michigan Legal Services were to give seniors one line of advice before renting, it would be."Get everything in writing. Promises mean nothing. Speaking at the Schoolcraft College

Senior Forum. Shrager outlined the changes in the last five years in the law regarding tenants and landlords. Advising seniors of the Michigan Tenants' Rights Act. Shrager defined

its three points.

"EVERY LEASE must be fit for the use intended; every lease must meet safety and health standards and every lease must be in reasonable repair," he said.

"Even if these provisions are not listed in your contract, the landlord is responsible for them. It is not your responsiblity to fix everything that breaks; it's the landlord's.

"You do not have to pay the rent if he refuses to repair something, but he does not have to fix what the tenant has broken if it is the fault of the ten-If a landlord refuses to make neces-

sary repairs, the tenant may withhold his rent. The landlord must issue a seven day notice, warning the tenant to pay his rent or face eviction.

"THIS NOTICE is a necessary demand made by the landlord but it is not the law," Shrager said. "To evict, a landlord must take his tenant to

"If a landlord takes you to court. keep in mind that you're not necessarily going to be evicted. You don't need a lawyer to defend you and in cases where a tenant is complaining about a lack of repairs, the judge will often issue a compromise telling a landlord to make repairs and the tenant to pay his rent."

Shrager pointed out that a landlord must give his tenant 30 days notice to leave if the tenant does not have a

"A landlord does not have to have a reason to evict you," Shrager said. "But he can not evict you for retaliatory reasons."

ACCORDING TO SHRAGER, if a landlord wins an eviction case the tenant has 10 days to vacate-his dwelling. And if the tenant has withheld

rent, the landlord may ask the judge for a money judgment, can keep the withheld money from the security deposit or seek collection proceedings.

A common mistake renters often make. Shrager contended, is that they fail to notify the landlord of their complaints.

"You'd be surprised how many people keep their complaints to themselves," he added. "If you're dissatisfied, don't keep it a secret. It stands to reason that unless a landlord knows about your problem he isn't able to help you.

SHRAGER POINTED OUT that breaking a lease is not an easy matter but he suggested the tenant inform his landlord of his intentions by mail.

"There's no harm in seeing what

the landlord has to say, although the tenant is liable for the entire length of "The landlord is not entitled to keep

the security deposit unless he loses rent. If you move out and he rents to another, you are not liable," Shrager "And the landlord has to make a good faith effort to find a tenant. He

can't let the apartment remain "What I would recommend is that the tenant give 30 dys notice and not pay the last month's rent. He has

probably kissed his security deposit goodbye as a vast majority of landlords would use the breakage of the lease as an excuse to take the deposit.

"And if you can find another tenant, that's a perfect defense for yourself."

Occult emphasizes experience, according to U-D professor

"The occult can mean a number of things," said Dr. John Saliba, SJ, a professor of religious studies at the University of Detroit.

"It involves something hidden, secret, beyond human understanding," he said. "It is concerned with the twilight zone. It is esoteric and understood by a select few. It involves study of matters not usually studied."

While billed to speak on "Exorcism. the Occult and Alternative Religious Experiences." Dr. Saliba confined himself to the last two subjects in his talk at Schoolcraft College during Futures week.

"The first thing that strikes you when you try to evaluate the occult is the enormous emphasis on experience." said Dr. Saliba, a native of Malta, who studied at Oxford University in England and at Catholic Uni-

"I believe because I have experienced" is the phrase often used by believers in the occult, he explained.

"Most of these people are conhe continued. "Their conversion was reached not through books or through friends. They themselves experienced something. It is

hard to explain to a person who has Advancement of Science has included experienced it that his house is not

Dr. Saliba said: "Christianity has lessened the importance of personal experience. It is now a little package handed over to us by our parents. We think of religion as things we must or must not do."

In keeping with the theme of the week, Dr. Saliba suggested that experience may be more emphasized in

"Yet the mysterious element in life is not completely irrelevant,' he said. "Perhaps it answers a human need. Every religion has its mysteries, even Christianity. Many of these smaller groups that are springing up emphasize that only they know the real mys-

According to Dr. Saliba, if a person wants to study the occult, he will first have to study extrasensory per-

People in occult movements claim ESP powers," he said "perhaps I am sceptical about it because I haven't any such powers."

To illustrate the current widespread interest in ESP. Dr. Saliba mentioned that the American Academy for the

"The Soviets are also experimenting with ESP, especially concerning its use in warfare," he said. "If they are looking into it then we have to look, too. Both the U.S. Air Force and the Navy are investigating it."

He added: "Some magazines did polls and found that a lot of people believe in ESP. But there are so many fakes in it that it is difficult to be sure. The experimentation is not easy.

"The center at Duke University organized to study ESP is disintegrating because it is so difficult to experiment with it. I am not saying we should not investigate parapsychology but the scientific studies are not very encour-

When tests were done on water deviners in the 60s, the results were not positive and the deviners said they didn't feel comfortable in a laboratory situation."

Dr. Saliba concluded by saying that interest in the occult goes up and down in popularity.

"Whenever society changes rapidly, these changes are accompanied by an interest in the occult," he said.

As a result of parent and teacher interest, a fourth mini-course session has been added to the curriculum. Students will be able to choose from 55 mini-courses throughout the school

New auto supplier soars despite economic picture

A Clarenceville High School graduate has returned to Livonia and established an industry which is experiencing unusual success during its infant year.

Robert LaLonde, president and chief operating officer of Madison Products Inc., graduated from Clarenceville High in 1969. He moved away from the area 10 years ago but returned to Livonia in 1971 and has lived here since.

MADISON PRODUCTS is the "new kid on the block" in the Plymouth-Levan Industrial Park between Schoolcraft and Plymouth roads in Livonia.

The firm, in production since June 1 of this year, supplies spark plug boots and distributor nipples to the automotive industry - for both new cars and the aftermarket. The "boot" is the part which covers the spark plug and the "nipple" at the other end of the wire connects to the distributor. The company manufactures only the two connecting ends, not the wire.

No natural rubber is used in the manufacturing process. Instead, a synthetic rubber derived from a petrochemical material has been formulated to the company's specifications.

Along with prepping and finishing equipment. Madison uses transfer molding auto-hydraulic presses. The

presses manufacture four variations each of boots and nipples, for various makes of cars. Some 240 units are made on the press of each mold, for a manufacturing output of 10-12.000 units per shift. There are three shifts operating 24 hours a day on four presses. That adds up to about 120,000 units made each 24 hours.

WHAT MAKES the infant company unusual is the current state of the economy, says LaLonde.

With inflation and recession running rampant and taxes, wages, prices and unemployment skyrocketing. why would anyone want to start a business? "There was a tremendous challenge to start with nothing to see if I could succeed," answers LaLonde.

. "It is more gratifying to own a business and because I had a sales, administrative and manufacturing background, I felt I had to make a try."

A market survey showed there was a serious lack of good, competent.

manufacturers of his products, La-Londe adds. "Regarding my product, the demand exceeds the supply." LaLonde decided to go into business

as a matter of timing. There was sales availability and he had the money needed, confidence in the capitalist system and a feeling the economy would soon turn for the better. The only obstacle he could see was a shortage of materials, but so far he's had no problems.

BY CONCENTRATING on high volume parts production and less diversification of the custom-molding process, LaLonde has been able to produce more units than originally forecast when he went into production.

At the end of the third month of operations (August), profits on sales exceeded forecasts by 48 to 50 per cent. Fourth month figures aren't complete. but he expects they will exceed even the August figures.

LaLonde is currently shipping between 1.5 to 2.5 million units a month. Company growth has been so fast the firm is increasing production capital by 50 per cent by purchasing additional presses for the 8.000 square feet of manufacturing space.

Before the start of production at Madison. LaLonde resigned his position as vice president and general manager of Southfield's Periflex Division of Flexible Products where he had been employed since 1964, starting as a shipping foreman.

. LaLonde is 34 and his plant manager, Steve Semenuk, is only 24. Two foremen who work for Semenuk are 21. The firm employs a total of 20 per-

LaLonde started with an investment of \$120,000 for equipment. He leases the building in the industrial park and has plenty of room for expansion. Of the 8,000 square feet, spme 7,500 square feet is used for manufacturing. Although new car sales may be down, LaLonde's firm is doing a big business in the aftermarket. With people holding onto their cars longer, there is a large demand for parts from auto parts stores and Madison Products shipments to the aftermarket is booming, says LaLonde.







'A shot in time' is offered by clinics

You started your baby's immunization shots, you're sure, but the records are lost and you're not quite sure whether he received the full number required to guard against the various childhood diseases.

Or maybe you've moved from another area, and the series of shots never were completed.

Younger children in the family perhaps haven't had the same attention in doctor visits that you gave the older ones, because those visits have become so much more expensive.

But, you figure, childhood diseases are not terribly severe and anyway most other children are protected. So there's not much to worry about. Right?

Wrong!

THE FACTS, as reported by the Wayne County Department of Health, show that now that it's possible to immunize all children against all communicable childhood diseases, an alarming number are going without this pro-

That is the reason for the immunization clinics scheduled Sunday, Oct. 27. in St. Mary Hospital of Livonia, Garden City Osteopathic Hospital and several other locations in Wayne County.

They are free, and they offer parents a chance to get protection for their children against diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus. polio, measles and rubella.

The hours for the clinics, when both hospitals will be staffed to dispense a variety of shots, are noon to 5 p.m.

INFORMATION ON IMMUNIZA-TION in Michigan from the state department of health contains some startling statistics concerning the prevalence of protection against childhood

Based on spot surveys of both school-age and pre-school children

they show that: The full component of three or more doses of oral polio vaccine has been received by only 58 per cent of the

children in grades one to six and by only 63 per cent of those born between October and December of 1970. Just under three-quarters of both groups checked had received vaccina-

tion against rubella, the disease that is usually mild but can cause serious complications if contacted during preg-Immunization against measles is

just 85 per cent for both age groups. and that includes children who have had the disease itself. The survey also shows the number

of children who have had DPT vaccine, which protects against diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough in one shot, also is about 85 per cent.

Henry C. DOWNS, immunization representative for the Michigan Department of public health, said that last year some 40 free clinics in De-

troit and outer Wayne County handled more than 11,000 immunizations.

"Almost 7,000 of those people were from the outer Wayne County area."

"This fact alone indicates there is a need for further work in the outer part of Wayne County.' Downs also stated that up to July 28

of this year there had been 1,881 cases of measles reported in Michigan, 1.139 cases of rubella and 5,293 cases of Those figures, he said, make Michigan's incidence of mumps the highest

the United States this year and rank the state second highest in rubella and fourth highest in measles.

THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT lists the following guide to basic immunization for children

Oral Polio-threee or more doses plus a booster at kindergarten age. Diphtheria, tetanus, whooping caugh-three or more doses plus booster at kindergarten.

Measles-one dose, given at age 12 months and above. Rubella-one dose, given at ages 12

months to puberty. Mumps-one dose, given at ages 12 months and above.

St. Mary Hospital is located at Five Mile and Levan and Garden City Osteopathic is at 6245 Inkster.

Another clinic will be held in Wayne County General Hospital, Merriman Road south of Palmer.

Transportation bond issue: State's biggest ballot decision in years

Most ballot proposals are matters of detail or projects pushed by a particular interest group. Only once in a decade or longer does the voter get to decide on a truly momentous project. The new constitution decision of 1963 was one. On Nov. 5 there will be another-Proposal D, the \$1.1 billion transportation bond issue

If you vote on nothing else in this election, and if you vote in no other elections for several years, you should vote on Proposal D. We endorse it as strongly as we have ever supported anything.

IT WOULD BE nice to call the transportation bond issue an "inspired" piece of legislation, "visionary," perhaps "futuristic." The truth, however, is that our metropolitan area and Michigan in general are lagging far behind other parts of the nation.

Look in the histories of our state and region. and you'll have to conclude that our public transportation is literally worse today than a half-century ago, when at least there was an interurban. Plainly, we have to catch up. Here's our chance: Proposal D.

A maze of programs is involved, but the essence is simple. It would authorize the state to issue \$1.1 billion in general obligation bonds and repay principal and interest from the general fund. With economic growth and the retirement of other bonds, no new taxes should be needed.

The bond issue would provide the state's share of an overall \$6.25 billion balanced transportation program for all of Michigan--not just Detroit, not just our suburbs, not just the outstate area or the upper peninsula. ALL of Michigan.

CONSIDER: \$362 million for statewide improvements to inter-city rail (both passenger and freight) and bus systems: \$100 million for airport development and improvement, \$50 million for Great Lakes port development, \$25 million for non-motorized facilities (such as bicycle paths). \$20 million for new "people mover" systems at four locations, downtown Detroit. Metro Airport. Grand Rapids and Saginaw...

....And the biggest chunk of all, \$540 million, 49.2 per cent, for urban public transportation for southeastern Michigan. That's us-half the population of the state. That's the 1990 program of rapid transit devices and buses.

The studies, the reports, the inventories have largely been completed by the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority. Talking time is over. One rail-type line for the Woodward corridor, another for the Northland-Detroit connection. another to Ann Arbor; high speed bus type lines along I-96 from Detroit to Plymouth, along Eight Mile. Southfield Telegraph; a maze of local fee-

No, it won't put all of us in subways. But Proposal D will give all of us-rich and poor. executive and factory hand, housewife and student and retiree-some choices about how we travel and some relief from our utter dependence on a car 100 per cent of the time.

Most ballot proposals are mundane matters. Proposal D is a truly momentous decision. The transportation bond issue deserves everyone's sup-

A 'spoiler' plan


Opponents of public transportation have their own proposal on the ballot, one that superficially seems innocent enough.

Proposal A, if approved, would (1) prohibit the use of motor fuel tax funds for highway patrol purposes and (2) forever limit the use of motor fuel taxes for public transportation at 1-18th of the amount received.

The second part contains the fishbooks. Just because Michigan today is using 1-18th of its gasoline and weight taxes for public transportation, do we have to be locked into that rigid constitutional formula forever?

Proposal A is bad constitutional law. A constitution should give us a form of government, not petty details that our legislators can handle on a year-to-year basis.

Proposal B on the Nov. 5 ballot is entitled "Vietnam and Other Veterans' Bonus Bonds.

If passed, it would authorize the state to borrow \$205 million to pay veterans of the Vietnam war, a lump sum of \$600 and other veterans who served between Jan. 1, 1961 through Sept. 1, 1973 a service bonus of \$15 for each month they served in the armed forces.

The bonds that the state would float would be paid from the general fund on the basis of \$612 million a year.

Milford case repeats lesson to youngsters

One wonders when the youngsters of today will learn or conjectures if they ever will. What brings this up? Something had to be said after the incident at Milford High a few days ago when several students were rushed to hospitals from the effects of an unusual drug.

Seems a pusher sold the students on some pills that normally are used as tranquilizers for horses, and though most of us feel and believe we are strong as horses, the effects of medication can be quite different.

We don't profess to know anything about the effects of horse tranquilizer pills on humans but we do know what has happened in the case of two high schools in widely separated sections of the same area

In the Milford case, the students collapsed and almost died before being taken to hospitals where it was touch and go for two or three days for several. Whether there will be a permanent after effect isn't known at this time but the fact remains that teeners have been sold on the idea of taking pills that give them a kick... in this instance, a kick almost out of this world.

Milford isn't the only high school to have gone through the horse pill stage. It happened at Livonia Churchill last spring, and the meager reports we were able to get out of school officials were that several students were taken to the hospital at that time. It also happened at Inkster High. Those horse pills really do have a kick, a kick that can wind up sending business to the area undertakers.

Then there was the incident at a nearby community where a youth passed his 18th birthday and decided to celebrate reaching the age of majority by getting drunk. He did. So well, in fact, that he had to be rushed to the hospital where he died from the effects of alcoholism.

In Livonia recently, students joined in funeral services for a classmate who reportedly became well acquainted with drugs. So well in fact that he decided there wasn't anything worth living for in this world and he ended it all via the carbon monoxide route.

Are incidents of this kind worth it all? Isn't is about time that youngsters read and reread this type of thing and decided whether that's what they would like or whether it's about time for a haircut and a new Young America look that is so much needed.

We're paying more

One of the sour facts of today's inflation is that it is affecting most harshly prices of natural commodities. Copper. Oil. Wheat. Aluminum. Meat. All have zoomed in price in the past And the automobile industry, which uses cop-

per and aluminum, has had to increase car prices. The baking industry has increased the price of a loaf of bread. And we all know what's happened to meat.

Another natural commodity that has zoomed in price is paper. That concerns us at this newspaper very much.

In April 1972, we were paying \$165 per ton of newsprint. We are now paying \$234 per ton, and we will be paying \$260 per ton on Jan. 1, 1975. That makes a 42 percent increase as of today, with a 58 percent increase in the offing for next

THAT IS WHY, with extreme regret, we have been forced to increase the price of our newspapers. Our home delivered Carrier Subscription Plan will go from 75 cents per month to 90 cents per month for October, and we will have to increase the prices of our mailed editions in Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills. West Bloomfield and Troy shortly.

Quite simply, we have little choice in the mat-

The newspaper you are reading now costs a little more than 19 cents in newsprint alone, without counting ink, salaries, production costs, depreciation and debt service. For this, you pay 15 cents per copy newsstand price and even less for the Carrier Subscription Plan.

Per week, on the average, the newsprint in these newspapers averages around 30 cents. This makes a newsprint cost of \$1:20 per month, which makes the 90 cent home delivery charge a real

IN ADDITION, the boys and girls who deliver our papers will receive a part of this increase in the form of added profits to their routes. This gives them greater incentive to give you good delivery service.

Other than meeting the increased price of newsprint, the increase will help enable us to afford to keep improving your newspaper.

Our editorial staff has been strengthened. just as our local news space has been increased. We are planning a whole new department in our Monday edition, to be called The Good Life, which will be an exciting enterprise in local suburban journalism. And we are continuing to make equipment improvements that make it possible for us to be the most complete source of local, relevant news and information in the area.

'Ability to pay' socks middle class

One of the propositions before the voters is the elimination of the sales tax on food and drugs. The justification for the elimination of this tax is that it is "regressive."

Among political scientists, regressive taxation means that, while the poor pay the same rate as the wealthy, they are in fact taxed more heavily on a percentage-of-total income basis. This is considered to be bad.

The opposite of regressive taxation is "progressive taxation," which political scientists call 'ability to pay.

Ability-to-pay means that when you need more money, look in areas where there is more money and then tax it.

THE TROUBLE with these magic tax words is that there is no foundation for them in our Con-

Our country was founded because the colonists objected to taxation without representation. The Declaration of Independence states that

all men are created equal.

Under our laws, all men are to be treated equally and not discriminated against because of their race, color or previous condition of servi-

But when it comes to taxation, because of expediency in finding tax dollars, we now say that even though each citizen of the United States is entitled equally to share the benefits and responsibilities of our laws and our governmental, services, some people by law must pay more for that privilege than other people.

IT MIGHT BE idealistic to think that all men should contribute equally to their government, but it always seems strange to me that the people who promoted one-man one-vote and equality in rights were also the promoters of taxation based on the ability to pay.

Taxation based on ability to pay is one reason the amount of money government spends each year gets greater and greater.

The majority of people, in pure numbers, are on the lower economic scale in this country, but they elect the majority of people in government.

The representatives in government can spend more and more money to please these people. knowing that the people who elected them will not, in fact, be footing the bill. The irony of the ability-to-pay theory is that

the poor pay very little for the support of their government, yet benefit the most and the very wealthy, benefitting from shrewd tax advice, also pay a small percentage of their income toward governmental operations.

The result is that middle-class working people bear the burden of supporting the government and they probably get the least from the government in return.







The first play of the second half all but decided the fate of Thurston as Bruce Ward hauled in the kickoff and sped 90 yards to paydirt. Quinn missed on the PAT and with just 13 seconds gone in the third quarter, it was 20-0 Franklin.

That was about it for the Franklin offense with Thurston's drive in the waning moments of the third quarter the solo sparkle the rest of the way.

The Eagles started on their own 12 with 1:24 remaining in the third stanza and after a roughing the kicker call and a Piligian to Abundis pass that took it to the Franklin 24. Drozdowski carried it to the Franklin nine and Piligian to the seven.

But once again a Thurston turnover saved the Patriot defense which has given up only 16 points this campaign while the offense has rattled off 134 points.







· The curtain goes down on the last of Michigan's major harness racing fineetings Saturday when Wolverine Raceway presents its 82nd and final program of 1974.

The season will go into the record books as the best late summer and fall campaign in Michigan history. And unless wagering falls off to nothing on the final two nights, Wolverine should end the year with a nightly mutuel handle of around \$710,000.

That's considerably better than the





\$867.000 recorded in the spring of 1973 when the big mile track had the best season ever for a harness racing operation in the state.

HAZEL PARK wiped out all of those records last spring with a big. fat \$813,000 average which has to be the best in Michigan and just shows what can be accomplished. The meetings at Wolverine and Hazel Park definitely prove harness racing has arrived in Michigan and soon will be pressing the thoroughbreds for crowds and wagering.

There were quite a few Fridays during the year when one or the other of the two big tracks bettered the attendance and handle at the runners. Especially was this true during the spring when Hazel Park competed against the Detroit Racing Association.

It will be 10 races Friday and 10 more Saturday and then the gates will be closed at the Detroit Race Course until late January when the thoroughbreds check in for the start of the season in mid-February

Inasmuch as Saturday will be closing night, the track management is looking forward to a million dollar handle for the season windup. There's every reason to believe it will happen if the weather is anything like it was early in the week

BUT EVEN BEFORE Saturday. Racing Secretary Bill Connors took off for Florida to visit with his family for a couple of weeks before starting work on the Pompano Park season. The trotters and pacers will go there on the weekends only in November and the early part of December before the season actually opens in full

During the latter part of the week, many stables shipped out for Northville Downs where the Jackson meeting opens Monday and some to Windsor where the action begins Sunday

It will be interesting to see how Windsor fares with night programs on Sundays. The nocturnal races didn't take too well in the east, especially in the New England area. And there's considerable question whether they'll be accepted in staid Canada.

Of course the answer is that Hazel Park is still holding Sunday afternoon programs and probably will until the weather gets too bad.

GREG WRIGHT, the Canadian driver-trainer, appears to have the driving championship all wrapped up at Wolverine. With three nights remaining of the season, Greg had an edge of 10 wins over second place Chris

Boring of Adrian. However, one couldn't count out Chris who had a string of three in a row Monday and appears to have his horses at top form right now. Could be the race won't be decided until the final night.

Tom Smith will make up the races for the Jackson season opening Monday at Northville Downs. Just to get the ball rolling. Tom has scheduled a pacing series with several \$5,000 weekly events and then a \$10,000 championship for the finalists in the point stand-





Time to check heating system

energy can victimize all ners if they don't prepare for the; winter heating season, says James P. Thomas, division manager for Consumers Power Company's West Wayne Division, headquartered in Livonia.

When we say 'wasted energy' we refer to that amount of heat that escapes from a home because of poor or inadequate insulation, granty windows, dirty furnace filters or other equate insulation, drafty win-

wasteful practices." Thomas said. He recommended that homeowners give their entire home heating system a thorough inspection this time of the year to ensure that it is in peak condition for winter.

"We urge you to check your furnace for two reasons-efficiency and safety." Thomas said.

"Dirty or clogged filters will not allow the furnace to operate efficiently and this wastes fuel. If a chimney is clogged with an obstacle

THOMAS SAID that Consumers Power studies show that up to onethird of the fuel used for heating a home can be wasted if the dwelling is improperly insulated and overly

He suggested the following tips to help ensure that the home and not the outside air is heated:

Properly insulate the dwelling. The general recommended level is six

inches of quality insulation in the ceiling to keep the heat inside where it is needed.

Install storm windows. Their cost can be recovered in a few years through energy savings you will realize. The storm windows keep heat from escaping through drafty win-

Keep the fireplace damper closed when the fireplace is not being used. Warm air rises, and the heat in your den or living room will leave the home through an open fireplace damper. Always be absolutely sure fire is completely out before closing damper.

Keep window shades, curtains and draperies drawn at night. It helps insulate against the cold.

Check all radiators, grills, vents and registers to be sure they are free from obstructions that would restrict the flow of heat.

CHECK FOR PROPER humidity in your home. Dry air requires more heat to maintain comfortable warmth.

If part of the home is not being heated, such as a garage, basement, attic or spare bedroom, keep doors to them closed and sealed off from the rest of the house.

Caulk leaks or cracks in foundation, walls, or along sills with a good grade of caulking compound. Studies show that a crack equal to a one square inch hole will let in about 100 cubic feet of cold air per hour.

Lower thermostat setting by a minimum of five degrees at night upon retiring, or at any time when your home is not occupied for a period of time.

It is estimated that by lowering your thermostat the recommended five degrees just during the eight-hour sleeping period at night will result in a seven per cent energy savings. Additional information on preparing

Reuther charges Esch with franking abuse

THE OBSERVER & ECCENTRIC

Democratic challenger John Reuther says 2nd District Congressman Marvin Each is abusing his so-called "franking privilege" - the right of a congressman to use the mail without

paying postage.

Each (R-Ann Arbor) insists he uses franked mail "to communicate with my constituents" and has never abused the privilege.

In a recent debate in Livonia, Reuther accused Esch of using a constituents' newsletter to "raise a false issue" on a tax bill. Each's newsletter said the House Ways and Means Committee was considering removing gifts to churches and colleges as tax deductible items. It included a form which citizens could mail back to Esch to register their opposition to such a change.

REUTHER SAID he checked with staff members of the Ways and Means Committee and Mills' office and found that such a proposal "was not being considered and was not on the calendar."

Reuther said Esch falsely claimed credit for getting the plan killed. Said Esch: "The Ways and Means Committee or Mills may have told Reuther that donations wouldn't be removed as a tax deduction." but the issue was nevertheless real

"It was an issue to colleges and uni-

versities and to many ministers, both inside and outside my district," said Each, insisting that the response ac-

tually helped kill the proposal.

Each added that he had introduced a House bill on campaign reform that would have prohibited congressmen from sending out franked newsletters 60 days prior to an election.

SHORTLY AFTER the debate, Each released a copy of an Oct. 10 letter to Reuther in response to Reuther's request for the number of franked mailings Esch had circulated since being elected in 1966.

Esch wrote: "It is understandable that as a newcomer to the 2nd Congressional District, you would not be familiar with the mailings I have sent to my constituents.

"I have not utilized newsletters to, communicate with my constituents during this period (60 days prior to Nov. 5), but I have kept up a steady flow of correspondence in response to the heavy load of legislative and case mail I receive."

ESCH WAS asked by this newspaper about a franked news release dated Oct. 9 from himself and the House Republican office.

He said such releases to newspapers and broadcasters were "a service to newsmen who did not attend the events described in the press re-

Esch requests investigation of freon peril

Congressman Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) has called for a congressional investigation of University of Michigan warnings that escaped freon gas from aerosal cans poses a potential danger to the world's population.

Esch has requested hearings in the House science and astronautics subcommittee on science as soon as possible after Congress reconvenes Nov.

He cited warnings that freon gas could chemically control the stratosphere by 1985, and that sufficient quantitites of the gas could partially destroy ozone and increase the danger of skin cancer.



PLYMOUTH IRON WINDMILL COMPANY in 1889. Formed in 1882 to make windmills, the name of the company was later changed to Daisy in 1895 after the firm began manufacturing air

rifles. The building shown is part of the building now occupied by Distribution Services, Inc. on Union Street, just east of Main Street in downtown Plymouth.

Plymouth was 'air rifle capital'

From the turn of the century to 1958. Plymouth was the air rifle capital of the world. During that period "BB" guns manufactured in the city made their way around the globe. For many years China was the largest foreign market for air rifles made on Union Street in Plymouth.

Plymouth's air rifle era began in 1885 when the Markham Manufacturing Company, initially formed for the manufacture of tanks and cisterns, introduced a "toy" rifle made of wood with a brass tube inside. Called the "Chicago." it was the first air rifle to be made in volume and sold at a popular price. W.F. Markham's plant was located on Main Street, just east of the railroad.

The reception given to the "Chicago" and to subsequent Markham brands, the "Prince" and the "King," was enough to make Markham a wealthy man even before he went to California and bought a large tract of land at what was to become Hollywood. Markham's success, however. was soon eclipsed by another Plymouth firm, Daisy, which was to become the "World's largest manufacturer of non-powder guns and ammo."
Prior to 1895, Daisy was known as

the Plymouth Windmill Company, a stock company formed to manufacture a self-controlled metal windmill based on a patent granted to Clarence J. Hamilton, Hamilton, a watch and window of R. L. Root's drug and jew-Kellogg Park.

Backed by Root. Hamilton initially made the windmills in a small frame building. Later others, including Lewis Cass Hough, became interested and, in 1882, the stock company was formed to acquire and produce the Hamilton Windmill. The new company bought 25 acres in the middle of Plymouth for \$400, and erected on it a two-story brick building with 8.000 square feet of manufacturing space The structure still stands, considerably enlarged over the years, on Union Street, just back of the Kroger



In 1888. Clarence Hamilton, influenced perhaps by the success of Markham, invented an air rifle made entirely of metal. In July of that year the board of directors of Plymouth Windmill, who had almost voted to liquidate the company six months before because of sagging windmill sales, decided to make a few of the rifles. Part of their thinking involved offering one of the guns free to any farmer who would buy one of their windmills.

In 1890, the officials of the company included hardware merchant Michael Connor, who was president; H. W. inal backer), secretary

In 1891, the firm hired a young man with a flair for the dramatic. Charles H. Bennett, to travel as a salesman at a salary of \$85 per, month and expenses. Sales of the air rifle began to mount as sales of the windmill continued to decline. In consequence of this, the board decided to change the firm's name to Daisy Manufacturing Company in 1895.

In its rise to the top Daisy did not lack competition. In addition to Markham, there soon appeared, in Michigan alone. a plethora of BB guns. These included the "Globe." made by J. A. Dubuar Manufacturing Company. Northville (1894); the "Cyclone" by A. R. Wheeler Company, Grand Rapids (1898); the "Dewey" by Crescent Gun Company. Saginaw (1899); and the "American Dart" by Upton Machine Company, St. Joseph

Daisy handled some of this competition by the process of absorption. acquiring Dubuar in 1903 and Markharn in 1912. (Dubuar owned the sawmill in Northville which later bécame the Ford valve plant).

Daisy became Plymouth's largest employer. Karl Starkweather. who worked at Daisy in 1906, when he was 16, told me that he operated a punch press 10 hours a day, six days a week. for a weekly pay of \$6.50. He recalled that others in the plant earned as much as \$10.50 a week.

Company officials, including Lewis Cass Hough, Charles H. Bennett, Edward C. Hough, and later Cass S. Hough, played key roles in the life of the community.

The best known during his day, and perhaps the most colorful. was Charlie Bennett, whose sales trips took him around the world several times. Bennett introduced the air rifle into practically every civilized country except Russia. In China, where there was fear that the BB gun might be dangerous, the resourceful Bennett invited a mandarin to shoot him in the derriere to prove that the Daisy was harmless and should be imported. Charlie won his point, but ate the next several meals standing up.

Following the death of H.W. Baker in 1920. Bennett was named president of Daisy. He held the position until his own death in Plymouth on Sept. 17. 1956 at the age of 94.

Sales tax repeal: Focus of campaign

A partial repeal of the sales tax has emerged as one of the few hard differences between two moderate candidates for governor- incumbent Republican William Milliken and Democratic challenger Sander Levin.

Milliken opposes Proposal C on the Nov. 5 ballot which is aimed at amending the Michigan constitution to repeal the four per cent sales tax on groceries and a two per cent tax on prescription drugs. (Still taxed would be "prepared" foods and alcoholic

Levin, a former state senator. favors the proposal, put on the ballot by a petition drive conducted by the Michigan Citizens Lobby.

Their chief differences are (1) how the lost revenue would be made up and (2) how bad a revenue source the sales tax really is. The candidates dis-

cussed the proposal in lengthy interviews with the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers Editorial Board.

MILLIKEN CONCEDES that the sales tax on food and drugs is what economists call "regressive" - it takes a larger percentage of low incomes than of high incomes.

"But you've got to look at the total impact of our tax program, which is very progressive," said Milliken, pointing to the state income tax with its program of family exemptions and credits.

"You need a mix of taxes - income, sales and property.

"If we were to remove the sales tax and go to the corporate income tax for the difference, a great degree of volatility would be introduced into our tax picture," said the governor, referring to the tendency of corporate profits (and taxes) to fluctuate greatly with the business cycle.

LEVIN CONTENDS that "Michigan is one of only two industrial states in the union with a sales tax on food and drugs" - the other being Illinois.

"New York, Ohio. Pennsylvania and the others have been able to do it without a sales tax on food."

Levin agrees that the "main problem with the income tax (as an alternative revenue source) is in the corporate sector, not personal income taxes." But he disagrees with Milliken that other taxes must be increased to make up for loss of sales tax revenue if Proposal C passes.

"The loss of revenue is only \$165 dustry than retail food, especially in million, not the \$200 million Milliken the Detroit area," Levin said. says," Levin began.

"First, I would favor postponing the further reduction of the inventory tax. That's \$40 million revenue there. "Second, we've got to look at wel-

fare and other programs. Just because some programs are working, it doesn't mean every program is working," he said, listing a re-evaluation of the state budget as his top priority if elected governor.

Milliken continued, "There's absolutely no assurance that the savings on food and drugs (from repeal) would be passed onto the consumers.

As for cutting the budget, Milliken said his administration is implementing recommendations to prevent overpayment of welfare and to keep unqualified persons from receiving it.

"A SHAM argument." counters Levin. "I don't buy Milliken's argument that the tax cut won't be passed down to consumers. Hell, he didn't say that when the federal auto excise tax cut was passed.

Levin also contends that Milliken is doing something about soaring welfare costs only because this is an election year. "The government is being forced to look at welfare by the federal government, by welfare's sheer size and its pressure," he said.

Fiscal experts say the sales tax on food and drugs produces about onefifth of all sales tax revenues. So the ballot proposal as worded would also "compensate units of government, other than the state, for the resulting loss of revenue by increasing each present allocation of sales tax revenue to such units by one-fifth."

Sales tax revenues support not only state government but are returned to local units. School districts, for example, get half the sales tax revenue. and cities, townships and villages get



"When we asked why, we found that many children get behind in the early elementary years and this makes them so frustrated they drop out. they also drop out because we do not have enough career education programs."

O'Neil explained that the state board told the schools that they would get \$200 per child in the lower percentile. But they wouldn't get it for a second year unless children achieved the norm for their grade.

More than two-thirds of these students achieved the minimum 75 percent of the stated objectives, causing the Times to observe that "such results are considered extraordinary a program the size of Michigan's!"

O'Neil is a man difficult to place in a political pigeonhole. He is often considered a conservative Republican and is remembered for his opposition to the teaching of sex education in the Livonia schools.

This opposition, according to O'Neil, was misunderstood. His objection was to the way he thought it was going to

be taught. Despite his many campaigns he has failed to find politics dirty. Rather, he finds politics vital and likes to quote the ancient Greek, Pericles, who said, "People who say they have no business in politics, have no business at

Esch proposes bill to fight unemployment

U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor), leading Republican on manpower policy in the House, has proposed creation of more than one million public service jobs over the next two years to counter rising unemployment.

The bill introduced by Esch, whose 2nd District includes Livonia and Plymouth, asks for a special report to congress before March 1, 1975, by the secretaries of Labor and Health, Education and Welfare into efforts by government to get people off welfare and

"I personally believe most Americans want to work rather than be on the welfare rolls," says Esch.

UNLIKE OTHER proposals, the bill doesn't require an unemployment level "trigger" but instead authorizes 39 billion over two years to be available to all communities now receiving grants under the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973 (CETA) of which Each was co-author.

"I believe this proposal to meet any worsening of the economy is fully in accord with the 'compassion and action' criteria set by President Ford Aug. 28.

Canning lids to be short throughout the season

Factory inventories of home canning lids are at a record low, and consumers should not expect a significant improvement in the supply during this canning season.

ESCH NOTED that under his pro-

posal \$4.5 billion would be authorized

Those are the conclusions of a U.S. Commerce Department study, according to Congressman Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) The study shows demand for canning materials has increased 170 per cent over last year. due to the increase in family gardening, and a shortage of tin plate. needed to manufacure the lids has lessened production.

"Industry informs us that all available home canning equipment has moved or is moving to retail stores." according to a report by Samuel B. Sherwin, deputy assistant secretary for domestic commerce. "Despite this effort, sources within government and industry agree that jar lids and caps will remain in short supply throughout

Esch said the shortage came at "a particularly unfortunate time, since millions of families planted new gardens in 1974, and the unavailability of canning jars and lids frustrated their efforts to cut food costs and inflation '

President Gerald Ford called for the Commerce Department study in response to a complaint from Esch that gardeners' produce is rotting in backyard gardens due to the shortage of canning materials.

Esch said he received numerous complaints about the increased covt and scarcity of canning jar lids.

'Hopefully." Esch said, "increased vigilance about the supply-demand problem will lead to a remedy for the future, and continued alertness by the appropriate agencies will prevent practices for which our consumers would be unfairly penalized."

The Federal Trade Commission and the Justice Department's anti-trust division are conducting independent investigations of the shortage, Esch

When you plant carrots remember: do it on Scorpio and they'll have nice. firm roots. If you plant in Cancer the profusion of roots may not take hold.

Hocus-pocus from a newspaper horoscope? Not to Mrs. Lawton Billings of Plymouth Township. The 72-year old great-grandmother has been planting by the phases of the moon and divisions of the zodiac for almost 50

years.
She has gotten her astrological gardening down to an exacting skill that pays off in abundant crops.

For Mrs. Billings it's only natural to plant everything "in the signs." "Everything was done by the signs

of the moon in Biblical days," she, said. That conviction and an astrology text she picked up in 1949 have consistently yielded harvests which would be the envy of any Farmer's Almanac

Phases of the moon usually last about seven days. The phases are a new moon, a first quarter moon (when it is waxing larger), a full moon and a last quarter (when it

Each phase spans a week during which three to four signs are dominant. Mrs. Billings consults her moon book for both the quarter and sign when the time is most propitious for planting a particular crop.

According to her studies, underground plantings should be made in the third quarter (full moon) under one of the water signs-Pisces. Scorpio. etc.

For maximum fragrance she plants many of her flowers in Libra.

Her apples are good this year. Mrs. Billings insists. because they were picked at the right astrological time. "If they're picked in the first or sec-

ond quarter bruise spots will tend to rot quickly." she said. In contrastand she has a golden delicious apple with a bite out of it to support her claim-bruises will dry and the apples will last longer if picked in the third or last quarters.

"It's a very deep subject." she said. out what you plant in the moon does very well and that's quite an argument. My mother and father always had a large garden and they never did anything until they consulted the Farmer's Almanac."

Mrs. Billings and her husband, who became a convert to moon gardening after his wife's plantings proved more successful than his own, keep a little more than an acre under cultivation.

Sometimes it's a rush to get the right seeds sown in the right sign in the right quarter. She planted pickles under Pisces in the first quarter. "I had to get them in in Pisces," she said. "Then I never saw so many pick-

The sprightly great-grandmother credits her ambitious gardening with keeping her healthy. "It's the bendng-I get so much exercise." she

Although she won't admit to being an extremist, she does schedule beauty parlor appointments according to the moon too.

Signs of the moon make the difference between a bumper crop and a lean harvest, Mrs. Billings insists, but astrology can't always work wonders by itself. She notes that sometimes even the mooh needs a hand.

"I'll tell you a secret." she said. "We use a little fertilizer too."



On the campaign trail

GOV. WILLIAM G. MILLIKEN walked doorto-door in Livonia Thursday in his first and probably only neighborhood walk. Most residents were startled by the governor's appearance on their doorsteps but asked him questions on pressing questions. The governor also discussed his anti-crime campaign, stressing

mandatory additional prison sentences for persons convicted of committing crimes with handguns. Crime in Livonia increased 21 per cent in the first nine months of the year compared to last year, although major crimes decreased.

County board urges support of vet bonus

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners is urging voters to support November ballot Proposal B which would provide a maximum \$600 bonus to some Michigan veterans who served in Vietnam.

The Board of Commissioners adopted in June a resolution calling for payment of the bonus and asking support from Wayne County voters. according to Robert E. FitzPatrick. board chairman.

FitzPatrick notes that Michigan has paid a bonus to veterans of both world wars and the Korean conflict.

If the proposal meets voter approval, veterans who served in Vietnam between January, 1961 and September, 1973 would be eligible for the bonus. Combat veterans could receive up to \$600, and non-combat veterans could qualify for a maximum \$450, based on the number of months of service. Beneficiaries of deceased veterans would also qualify.

FitzPatrick called the plan "essential and necessary to maintain the Michigan tradition of respect and appreciation for the fathers and sons who have sacrificed for us in time of need."
