Board breaks budget rules

Meeting last Thursday night, the board passed the \$1.482,100 budget only one day before the deadline for budget passage in charter townships. The legal questions raised by the adoption of the budget were not con-

tained in the budget itself, but rather in the procedures that are to be followed prior to board approval Moving for the passage of the budget board trustee Brian Schwall includ-

ed a request that the approval be con-

tingent on advice from the township

attorney or the legality of the pro-

Robert Greenstein, candidate for township supervisor, charged. This is not a lawful public hearing and the budget, if passed, is illegal

ACCORDING to Public Act 359. which regulates charter townships. specific procedures must be followed

CANTON - Canton Township for budget adoption Noting that a trustees have approved a 1975 oper—copy of the budget was not provided ating budget, despite protests that to the board by Sept 1 and that a copy of the budget was not available to the public at least one week prior to Thursday's public hearing. Greenstein charged the entire board with 'malfeasance, misfeasance, and dere-

liction of duty.

Section 24 of PA 359 states: "On or before the first day in August in each year, each township officer shall submit to the supervisor or to the township superintendent if such officer has been appointed an itemized estimate of the anticiapted expendiatures of the townshih for the next fiscal year for the township activities under his charge The supervisor, or township superintendent, as the case may be, shall prepare a complete itemized budget proposal for the next fiscal vear and SHALL SUBMIT IT TO THE TOWNSHIP BOARD ON OR BE-FORE THE FIRST DAY OF SEP-TEMBER.

Section 25 states: "A public hearing

on the budget shall be held before its final adoption, at such time and place as the township board shall direct. and notice of such public hearing shall be published at least 1 (one) week in advance by the township clerk. A COPY OF THE PROPOSED BUDGET SHALL BE ON FILE AND AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC FOR INSPECTION DURING OFFICE HOURS AT THE OFFICE OF THE TOWNSHIP CLERK FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 1 (ONE) WEEK PRIOR TO SUCH PUBLIC

Greenstein contended that the board purposely held the hearing on Halloween night, expecting a light turnout.

HEARING.

Phil Dingeldey, who will leave the township supervisor's job after tomorrow's election, indicated that the delay was justified, "because all of the material to prepare the budget was not available.

In a statement after the meeting. Dingeldey said he accepted full re-

sponsibility for the budget matter. Trustee James Poole, who is Greenstein's opponent in the supervisor's race, disclaimed any responsibility for the budget's delay Poole is currently a trustee on the board

"I ASKED about the budget two months ago," said Poole.

Greenstein had no reply when asked, following the meeting, why he did not inform the board earlier that it was acting illegally.

When Greenstein was asked during the hearing what he thought the board should do, he replied. "You can recog nize that you did a wrong and set a new public hearing. It not, someone could sue the board for maybe a million dollars.

It was then that Schwall seconded by Poole, moved for passage of the budget contingent upon approval of the attorney.

"Read the law." shouted Greenstein. "You can't solve one violation by making another.

PLYMOUTH-It'll be Levin in Lansing after election day if state voters follow the precedent of Plymouth Canton High School students who gave the nod to the Democratic gubernatorial candidate by a three-vote margin in a mock election Friday

Using Canton Township voting machines. 321 students cast their ballots with Sander Levin receiving 144 votes. William Milliken. 141 and Human Rights Party candidate Zolton Fe-

Canton government teacher Audry Etienne arranged the election to give her students some "practical expe-

'We were studying elections and I thought it might be a good idea if the students were given the chance to vote." Mrs. Etienne said.

"Canton Township Clerk John Flodin talked to our classes and trained 40 students to be precinct workers

'Their response has been fantastic." she said. "They've been excited because we're running the election just like the real thing

PRECINCT workers were trained to prevent students from voting twice and checked voter's names against school enrollment sheets to guarantee that only Canton students would be voting. They were also instructed to record voter numbers to insure that their machines would tally

"I really planned to hassle them if their machines didn't check out with their records." Mrs. Etienne said.

"But they double checked everything and did close them out without any problems."

If there were any difficulties in running the election they were caused by student enthusiasm.

"We had some trouble getting precinct workers to leave after their shift was over. Everyone just wanted to stay and work," she said. "And during the six hours the polls were open, we didn't have a single machine standing empty.

"The students had to vote on their own time and some of them had to leave before they got a chance to



'People are still going all over' despite energy crunch, economy

Local residents are boarding cars. trains and planes to set off for distant places, despite the energy crunch and dismal economic outlook that so far this year has made homebodies of many Michigan residents

Although statewide statistics from the Automobile Club of Michigan vacationed near home January through September, most local AAA offices and tavel agencies visited by the Observer-Eccentric have seen little change in their client's long-distance travel plans

STATE-WIDE REQUESTS for map routings from Michigan AAA members indicate an eight per cent drop in travel so far this year, according to Joseph Ratke. AAA touring manager. who predicts an upsurge in travel toward the end of the year.

Michigan travel to all parts of the country except New York and Washington D.C. has dropped. Ratke said. The biggest drop is to Florida. California. Mexico and the Southwest.

At the same time. Ratke notes an increase in travel near home. The number of Michigan residents who vacationed in eastern Canada increased 23 per cent, while the number of residents who chose vacation sites within Michigan increased nearly 15 per

This is quite a dramatic switch from the past." Ratke said.

I think the energy scare has contributed most to this decrease in travel I think the economic situation is having a lot to do with it now

"MICHIGAN MOTORISTS used to driving at 70 miles per hour had to add at least a day to their travel time increased promotion and advertising by Canada, certainly helps explain east Canada's increased popularity with Michigan tourists.

> Mrs. Wicke attributes the September slump to teacher strikes and lavoffs that preclude the forming of future vacation plans.

Business at Camelot Travel. 14223 Telegraph. Redford Township. has been the same as last year or better. according to owner Helen Haight.

We had less Europe travel, but, as a whole, we've had just as much business, if not better." Mrs. Haight said. People are traveling to nearby places more by air. I don't think it (the energy crisis and the economy) has hurt the travel as far as we're concerned.

MARY CONNER, manager of Plymouth Travel Consultants, 400 N. Main St., Plymouth, said business has been good at her office this year, with many clients already planning winter vacations to Florida. Acapulco and

Postmaster General E.t. Klassen says the new policy will benefit the general mailing public now paying for their postal service.

"It is unfair to burden the vast majority of mailers with costs created by the few who mail without prepayment

KLASSEN SAYS postage due delivery has also caused severe financial loss for utility companies, banks and department stores plus other business firms whose volume of unpaid mail has been increasing.

Postal Service officials estimate annual postage due losses to recipients of unpaid mail and the additional losses to the USPS run in the million dollar range.

As of Nov. 17, mail without any postage will be returned to the sender. Previously unpaid mail was generally delivered postage due.

Mail matter of any class, received at either the office of mailing or the office of the addressee without any postage on it, will be endorsed "returned for postage" and returned to the sender. No attempt will be made to collect postage due.

IF THE ENVELOPE doesn't contain a return address, it will be sent to the dead letter office for appropriate handling.

The new regulation doesn't affect business reply mail, federal govern-ment and free mail delivery to the blind, armed forces mail, or keys and identification devices returned to

Postal regulations, which have the full force of law, require prepaid post-

Bonds sold for new schools

SULLIVAN Nov. 5

PLYMOUTH-"The Plymouth School District did very well, considering market conditions and inflation," explained financial consultant Raymond J. Stauder after all the hids were in for the district's most recent construction bond issue.

The bond issue, passed last June 10 by a 57 per cent majority, provides the district with \$9.97 million in funds. The funds will be used primarily for the construction of three new elementary schools and an addition to Canton High School.

At a special meeting of the board of education last Wednesday night, sealed bids were accepted for the bonds. Three syndicates vied for the bonds, and competition was close between two of the three.

THE LOW BIDDER was a 20-mem-

ber syndicate co-managed by Halsey Stuart and Co. Inc., Goldman Sachs and Co., Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner and Smith Inc., and White Weld

The second lowest bidder was only \$8,200 higher, a very small amount considering the total bid, according to

The school district will now begin paying back the bonds, which have been issued over a period of 25 years, at a net (average) interest rate of 7.01

Total interest dollars paid back on the bonds will exceed \$12.3 million.

The school district will pay for the bond issue through increased tax levies, with the new bond issue raising the millage earmarked for debt retirement by 1.29 mills to 7.06 mills

The total levy for the school district is 36.01 mills, with most of that going to yearly operating expenses.

Stauder commented that the bids for the bond issue were very good despite the fact that the bond market recently had been glutted with Wayne County issues, primarily from Wayne County Community College and a Wayne sewer bond issue.

He said he had hoped to see the net interest rate drop under seven per cent, but when the market became "saturated" with other Wayne issues it became clear that such a low interest rate was unlikely. (Large investors who purchase bonds like to diversify their holdings-and if they hve already purchased other bonds from Wayne county they are less likely to puschase more from the same geographical area.)

STAUDER IS a member of the consultant firm of Stauder, Barch, and Associates hired by the school board for the bond issue.

brake service, tail pipes and mufflers. The first K-mart store opened in March, 1962, in Garden City after Kresge board chairman Harry Cunningham persuaded the board of directors to authorize the Kresge company entry's into discounting.

"Today's consumers are more knowledgeable about necessities, but they also have greater expectations about obtaining the nice things in life," said Cunningham.

"They believe they are entitled to not only what they need but to those things that will give them greater pleasure. They want hobby items, sporting goods, color televisions, swimming pools and health and beauty preparations.

'But they also want to save money," Cunningham concluded.

The idea was successful and now there are more than 673 K-mart discount department stores in operation in the United States, Puerto Rico, Canada and Australia, with more to come before the end of 1974.

Detector helps curb bad treats

PLYMOUTH—Unusually mild Halloween weather brought out an unprecedented number of "trick or treaters" but no place attracted a larger crowd than Plymouth City Hall.

Several hundred children, accompanied by their parents, had their treats checked for foreign metallic material by an ITT detector.

Operating the machine, under the supervision of local and state police, were volunteers from the community service class at Plymouth's Canton

and Salem high schools. Ray Hendrick, Richard Greenleaf, Gary Pulford, Bob Hendrick, Linda Hirzel, Chuck Wilson, Tom Hannula, Stan Reiman and Sue Messmore examined hundreds of sacks of candy.

The bag (pillowslip or plastic pump-kin) of bubble gum, fruit and candy was emptied on a table. Any candy bar with a torn wrapper was discarded. The rest of the contents were placed in a chute, a few items at a time. Metal passing over a spot midway down the slope caused a hinged section at the bottom to slip up, catching the suspected piece.

The youngsters waited anxiously by the box at the bottom of the chute which collected their loot. It was poured carefully into its original container and the next assortment was on

The bottom flipped several times. A penny caught under a candy bar wrapper was the culprit once. A person carrying a metal waste basket passed too closely and it responded. A small piece of foil also would set it off.

Although the line necessarily moved slowly, everyone was in good spirits. Members of the Salvation Army contributed to this holiday mood. Serving hot chocolate and cookies were Lt. Dallas Raby, Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Thomas, Viola Shisler and Edith Do-



But his point is basically good: The bedsheet ballot is too long and news coverage too rushed for voters to become fully imformed about lowvisibility races for educational and judicial posts.

A STATE COMMISSION appointed by the governor has suggested gubernatorial appointments for educational and judicial posts. I have reservations about this. You might get good appointments when the governor is good, but you might also get bad appointments when the governor is no good.

A better solution would be to move the elections for these posts to June of odd-numbered years. It preserves the test of election, reduces the number of posts and the ballot and allows adequate news coverage.

It's an all-woman race for commissioner

More women should be active in politics—it's a cry that's been heard throughout the land since long before women's liberation sharpened the ferninine image on many scenes.

And indeed, more women ARE ac-

tive in politics these days. Nowhere in Michigan can you see it more clearly than in the race for Wayne County commissioner from the 19th District.

There two women—both able, both Livonia residents and both having overcome male opposition—are finishing up their campaigns and ready to. await the voters' verdict.

MARY DUMAS, a Republican, is the incumbent and Barbara Johnson, a Democrat, is the challenger in the race that decides who represents the people of Livonia and Northville on the 27-member commission.

Both are firm believers in the women-make-good-politicians philosophy and both are well-grounded in political activity.

"IT'S GOOD this time to see my own name on the posters." said redhaired Barbara Johnson, whose memories of political campaigns go back to

the time when she was five years old. "I remember campaining for Mar-tha Griffiths even before labor endorsed her," says this daughter of a United Auto Workers educational di-

There were other electioneering experiences as she was growing up in Detroit and then, after she married and moved to Livonia, two tries for

Democratic precinct delegate. "I lost the first time, " she said, "and it made me so mad that I decided to try again." This time she rang lots of doorbells in her home area, where not too many people were identifying themselves as Democrats,

In the primary this year, she scored over fellow-Livonian Gerry Davis. We were friendly opponents and he's supporting me now," she added.

FOR MRS. DUMAS, political experience was a lot of activity in the Re-publican party and then such projects as managing the local campaign of Lenore Romney when the former first lady of Michigan ran for the U.S. Sen-

She tried twice—unsuccessfully—for a seat on the Livonia City Council and then was elected to the Schoolcraft ty government, Mary says her term

College board of trustees before setting her sights on the county commis-

sion post two years ago To win it. she defeated Eldon Raymond, whose father. Jerry tis a longtime Livenia councilman.

THE TWO LADIES have a lot in common, like being long-time Livonia residents and strong boosters of their home community. And being mothers of two daughters and one son. And getting a lot of support on the family

Mary's husband, Livonia businessman Victor, has put together her campaign literature and is described by his wife as "very supportive, even when I start talking politics in the middle of a television program."

The Johnson clan, teen daughters Kim and Kelly and son Keith, 11. have covered precincts for their mother and gone along for candidate nights, "staying up much later than they should because they were so interested," she says.

Barbara also points out that she isn't the only politician in her family-Keith ran for seventh-grade governor at Riley Junior High— and Mary mentions daughter Julie, "who says she hates politics but no one is more up to date in reading on the national issues."

MORE IMPORTANT, the two feminine candidates see eye-to-eye on the need for greater representation of the interests of this area on the county commission.

"I've worked very hard," says Mary Dumas, "to bring more programs in to this area, and I've run into a lot of resentment from others on the commission for doing so.

"But I tell them the possibilities are there, and there a lot of people in this area who need representation and if they want to do for their constituents what I've done for mine, they too have the opportunity."

For her part, Barbara Johnson decided to run in the first place because "I think Detroit has tried to monopolize Wayne County for too long. We have more people here and this trend is continuing.

"It's not that I don't care about the problems of Detroit, but more attention must be given to problems of this

WHILE BOTH WOMEN are strong in their support for an elected county executive and reorganization of coun-

on the board has given her a more practical view than she may once have had.

"I'm realizing more all the time that politics is the art of com-

promise, she explained.
"I definitely have long-range goals. for comprehensive, coordinated youth services, for out-county courts, for an elected county executive.

"But I realize that while I may want these things now, there are compromises that must be made, and I find that by keeping in mind what other areas want I have a better chance of getting what I want for my

But Barbara Johnson insists:

"I want reform NOW in county government. And I think it's time to move on a new jail now.

"I think it's time to stop stalling."

THE TWO CANDIDATES are glad

to be near the end of an active campaign, and both are-hesitant to assess their chances as voting time draws 'I've been walking the precincts

and had tremendous response," Mrs. Dumas said. "I find recognition, and I think people recognize what I have done to represent them. If the record counts I think I should do well.

"But I've never seen an election when people in this area seemed so unsettled.

And from Mrs. Johnson:

"I think the economic situation is going to have more bearing on the election than Watergate. But I hope Watergate does eventually bring complete campaign expense reform.

"I'd like to see all campaign expenses paid by taxes."

CLOSE TO THE END of this campaign road. Barbara Johnson expresses satisfaction that "it's been a clean campaign."

She also, remembering her children's bitter, disappointment when they were younger and she lost that precinct delegate race, has been

trying to instill into the trio some of her ideas about fair politics.

"It's not whether you win but whether the campaign is straightforward and fair. " she said. "That even it you don't win, you may have made some points with your opponent and perhaps modified some of his (or her)

But the children believe absolutely that I'm going to win. And certainly I want to win.

So does her opponent.

"I've begun a lot of things that I have not brought to fruition." Mrs. Dumas said.



Top RU, 14-7

Salem wins Sub 8

Redford Union wouldn't let stateranked Plymouth Salem have the Suburban Eight football championship without a dogfight, and second-place Trenton refused to let the Rocks back into their first undisputed title in 11

The Rocks had to prove their championship mettle all the way and they did just that with a hard-fought 14-7 victory over gutty, stubborn RU as Trenton, beaten only by Plymouth, stayed a length behind by edging Dearborn Edsel Ford, 24-21.

Salem finished the Sub 8 campaign at 7-0, winning its first crown since 1963, and is 8-0 for the season with one game to go. Trenton is 6-1 in the loop and 7-l overall.

Now, in Coach Tom Moshimer's eighth season at the Plymouth helm, the Rocks have a chance to match their school's greatest record of all time — the 9-0 mark of the 1952 Rocks. To do it they have to conquer similarly state-ranked Farmington Harrison, the Western Six champions, on the Hawk gridiron next Saturday afternoon.

PLYMOUTH ended its title drouth by scoring twice against RU the first three times it had possession of the ball, leading 14-0 after 17 minutes and then fighting off the Panthers tooth and nail the last 21/2 quarters.

Maybe the first few minutes were a mite too easy for the Rocks as they paraded 70 yards in seven plays from the opening kickoff for their first tally against the winless Panthers, and soon after marched 75 for the second

At any rate, it was 7-0 RU the rest of the distance and the Panthers produced some of the top excitement of the season when they kept the ball the final six minutes of the game—gam-bling four times on fourth down and winding up at the Rock 30 as time ran

The elated Moshimer, owning his first title since leaving Dundee in 1967 where his troops had won 33 in a row, called RU "the best 0-8 team I've ever seen."

"We made some costly mistakes after we went in front, but RU carried the fight to us all the way. They sure did come to play. We still have one more goal—an unbeaten season and you can tell Harrison that we'll be ready."

"Plymouth's a real fine team," said Coach Bob Atkins of RU, "and if you're the champ of our league you have to be the best in the area. We gave them all they could ask for and if it hadn't been for a dropped pass or two we might have pulled it out. Our kids were great.'

Plymouth's 5-8. 140-pound Joe Hibler keyed his club's opening drive with a 25-yard gainer and three other good spurts, quarterback Tom Dillon turning left end for 22 yards on a keeper for the first touchdown three minutes into the quarter. Doug Tripp kicked the first of his two conversions to make it 7-0 on the RU field, where Plymouth rooters at least equalled the number of home towners.

DILLON'S interception of a Craig Barrowcliff pass set the stage for the Rocks second successful march.

Key plays were a 26-yard aerial from Dillon to Mike Telekesy and a 29-yard sprint by Dillon. Hibler scored four plays later from a yard out. Tripp converting to make it 14-0.

Mark Cigna, a 5-6 workhorse; fullback Greg Johnson and Barrowcliff then led the resurgent Panthers 64 yards in 12 plays to put RU back in the ball game as Barrowcliff scored from the one, George Willard kicking the extra point making it 14-7 at half-

Barrowcliff's passes to Johnson and Craig Hill sparked that drive, sandwiched around sharp plunges by Cigna and Johnson.

Doug Tripp carried Plymouth within 6, and Redford Union 0-7, 0-8.

a yard of the RU goal in the third period, but two penalties killed that Rock threat. However, the Rocks came charging right back to the RU 10 on Tripp and Agnew runs, but after a holding penalty Plymouth fumbled and Dave Starin recovered for the Panthers to end that drive.

After an interception by the Rocks' Jim Anderson and a subsequent RU, fumble recovery by Dave White, the Rocks were backed against their own goal line when Charlie Johnston boomed a punt that rolled dead on the RU 21. There were still almost six minutes left.

WITH FOURTH down and one on the RU 30, Cigna plunged for two and a first down. With fourth and one on the 41, it was Barrowcliff who dove into the Plymouth line for the necessary yardage.

When it was fourth and 20 on the RU 35, interference was called against Plymouth at the 50 on a Barrowcliff pass and the Panthers had an automatic first down with 54 seconds remaining.

Both teams then gave it that final shot with Annapolis falling about 10 inches short of taking it all at the buz-



Glenn then played ball control and had the ball on the Berkley 10 when the final buzzer sounded.




THE CHIEFS made it as far as the three before having to give it up on downs. With 1:50 remaining, Woodhaven took over and ground out the
