## Paving projects 'lumped' in new city assessment plan

PLYMOUTH—In attempt to improve the efficiency of financing local street construction in the city, the city commission will be lumping all streets in its 1975 paving project into one special assessment district.

In the past, the city has set up a separate district for each street scheduled for repaving, but according to city manager Fred Yockey, if the streets are all similar they can be put together into one district to obtain more "consistency."

HE NOTED that other paving projects, when assessed on a street-by-street basis, had come up with slight deficits or surpluses. In the case of the surpluses, refunds were made and the deficits were picked up by the city, because, "It would have cost more to reassess for the difference."

The proposed project includes seven residential streets which are all the same width and which contains a minimal amount of excavation.

Yockey noted that his experience had been to place streets of like construction into one district with every one assessed the same amount of money per front foot. Cost estimates for the eight-inch concrete pavement have been placed at \$26.14 per front foot and \$13.07 per side lot footage (on corner lots).

THE TOTAL estimated cost of the project is more than \$355,000 with the city picking up close to half, or \$174,000, of the total. The remainder will be assessed to the owners of the more than 120 parcels of land affected by the repaving program.

The commission set a public hearing on the necessity of the paving project for Jan. 6 at 7:30 p.m. in the commission chambers.

The assessment will be spread over 10 years on the properties affected at an interest rate of nine per cent.

Commissioners approved setting the public hearing, but voiced their concerns over a section of the manager's report on the proposed project regarding the life expectancy of the project. Yockey's report listed a span of 15 years, while several commissioners felt the time was too short.

"I think it used to be 20 or 25 years before," noted commissioner Norbert Battermann. According to commissioner Harold Guenther, the expected life of a project is "like a warranty" on the improvements. Yockey said he would look into the reasons for the change in the figure but added, "as a practical matter I don't think it's going to make a bit of difference." Guenther agreed in principle but

noted the life expectancy was a type of "sales factor" when presenting the project to the property owners.

COMMISSIONER Joseph Bida questioned the cost increase over previous paving projects stating, "The \$26.14 is one heck of a price. I'm wondering if this is a realistic figure."

City engineer Allan Gove noted his estimates were based on an expected 10 per cent increase over last year's prices. Yockey also noted that if the estimates were not high enough it would be difficult to reassess, adding it would be much easier to refund any surpluses if original estimates were too high.

The commission also authorized purchase of a new truck body for the DPW, a gasoline storage tank for the

Buried cars, broken awnings, and the wonderful sport of "shoveling out" welcomed area residents Monday morning as the worst snow storm in nearly a century dumped 18 inches of the wet stuff on southern Michigan.

While most residents opted for staying home, a few brave souls ventured onto the roads, only to find their forward progress limited or completely blocked by the snow-clogged paths.

Residents in Plymouth fared the best, as city crews began work late Sunday afternoon to begin removing the first 6-8 inches of the fluffy stuff. By 5 p.m. Monday, city crews had put a plow to every street in town, making roads at least passable.

In the townships of Canton and Plymouth the situation was not quite as good, as county road crews were kept busy just keeping state and county roads open to traffic. Secondary roads and local streets took a back seat to the main routes, leaving many streets untouched by anything larger than a snow shovel until Wednesday.

One of the few serious incidents resulting from the storm was a reported heart attack by a 33-year-old Plymouth Township man on Monday. Plymouth firefighters also transported a 20-year-old man to St. Mary Hospital on Tuesday morning after the snow removal vehicle he was working to repair slipped into gear and ran over his arm.

Following a pumper truck into Wind-

sor Park subdivision, the Canton fire department ambulance picked up Mrs. Elaine Pilar Sunday evening for a quick trip to St. Mary so she wouldn't miss her appointment with the stork.

No other serious incidents were reported and both Plymouth Police and Fire Departments said the situation was "calm" in the city both Sunday and Monday.

"If I had my way we'd have snow every day," noted Plymouth Police Chief Tim Ford. When asked if it acted as a deterrent to crime, he said, "No, I just like snow."

As a result of the snow storm, the Canton Fire Department has added another vehicle to its fleet. Through the generosity of Supervisor Robert Greenstein, the township will have a snowmobile at its disposal for emer-

gency rescues. "I wasn't using it that much," noted Greenstein, "so I thought I'd leave it where it was really needed."

Plymouth Township Supervisor J.D. McLaren said he had few complaints about the storm other than "a few sore muscles that I didn't know I had."

Plymouth Fire Chief George Schoenneman asked residents to take one step of precaution because of the snows and uncover fire plugs that may be buried. "It will make them easier for us to find if we have to use them," he said.

At its regular Monday meeting, the Plymouth City Commission and City Manager Fred Yockey praised the work of the DPW crews for once again doing a fine job of snow removal.

## Work begins on Canton plan

CANTON—Recognizing that land use is a "top priority matter" all township officials have started a coordinated effort to develop a new master land use plan.

The planning commission and township board met Tuesday night to hammer out the "all important" new plan, and for the next several months one half of each planning commission meeting will be devoted to this end.

TOWNSHIP PLANNER Mike Manore led the meeting, proposing a calendar for the development and implementation of the land use plan and the zoning ordinances necessary to institute it.

He suggested the land use plan be adopted by July 1975 and the zoning ordinance by October 1975. He underlined the importance of quick action by saying "it is essential the land use plan be completed as soon as possible because when this economic slump is over we can anticipate even more building activity than in the past."

As Manore explains the situation, two documents must be developed. A master land use plan, which would detail the desired use of the land and a new zoning ordinance to carry out the intent of the plan.

Each document must go through several steps before ratification. First, goals must be established, then a rough draft, then a recommendation by the board or commission, then a

public hearing and finally a vote. Manore suggests rough draft work could take until the summer with a public hearing for the land use plan in June and possible ratification in July. The hearing and ratification of the zoning ordinance would then follow.

TWO MASTER land use documents have to be drafted, Manore says, one for a long range projection of 25 years, and one for 5-10 years.

The planning commission will be asked to adopt the shorter version, and the township zoning ordinance will also be fashioned from that.

The long term land use plan is more "hypothetical" because, as Manore says, "we just can't predict or see that far into the future. For practical reasons we'll have to work with a shorter plan."

However, he claims that with the de-

## Snow storm strands a few

WESTLAND—Lt. Dave Wilson sits at his desk bemused, and somewhat

amused, at the stack of bills piled high in front of him.

"We sure had some party," says Wilson, a security official at the Westland Shopping Center.

The bills, amounting to more than \$1,200, are the results of last weekend's snow storm which stranded more than 150 persons, compelling them to stay overnight in the center.

The marooned group of Christmas shoppers included persons from as far away as Windsor, who found themselves trapped in the shopping area at about 5 p.m. Sunday. Also trapped were residents from Livonia, Garden City, Westland, and Canton Township.

Officials at the center decided to close at 5:30 p.m. rather than 7 p.m. because of the snow, but realized by 4:30 that shoppers were going to be stranded, according to Wilson.

"We knew we were in trouble so we implemented impromptu emergency procedures. The first thing that had to be done was to collect shoppers who

# Big chance for transit input

The economic impact of rapid transit will be stressed by local speakers at a special western Wayne County meeting aimed at getting changes in the 1980 plan of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

The meeting — not legally a public hearing but having the same impact — is scheduled for Tuesday, Dec. 17 at 8 p.m. in the Forum building auditorium at Schoolcraft College, 18000 Haggerty, Livonia.

State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) arranged the meeting after several local officials complained that this section of Wayne County was eliminated from SEMCOG's rapid transit plan and had inadequate opportunity for comment.

Co-sponsoring the session is Observer & Eccentric Newspapers. Pursell will open the session. Tim Richard, Wayne County editor of the newspaper group, will be moderator.

SEMCOG OFFICIALS have orally accepted an invitation to present their justification of the plan. Expected to attend are either Michael Glusac, SEMCOG executive director, or John Amberger, his deputy, along with Gary Krause, a member of the planning staff.

Krause indicated they will make much the same presentation they did at a series of public hearings around the region. The closest one to this area was in Taylor and was attended by only one local public official and a handful of citizens.

The City of Livonia is expected to present figures on the number of persons working in the Schoolcraft-Plymouth roads corridor. That corridor is shown as a rapid transit line in the old Transportation and Land Use Study.

Pursell will arrange to get a representative from the state Department of Transportation.

Invitations are being sent to chief executives in the cities of Dearborn Heights, Garden City, Livonia, Northville, Plymouth and Westland and the townships of Canton, Northville, Plymouth and Redford.

THUS, THE MEETING will have much the same arrangement as the SEMCOG hearings with copies of any written presentations, and notes on oral presentations being forwarded to SEMCOG.

It will not, however, be an official hearing because legal notice require-

ments aren't being met. Nevertheless, the impact will be the same as a hearing because it is known that SEMCOG officials are paying close attention to the western Wayne County complaints.

Chief point of attack is likely to be SEMCOG's first criterion for being awarded a rapid transit line — that there be a congested freeway. The I-96 Jeffries freeway in the Schoolcraft

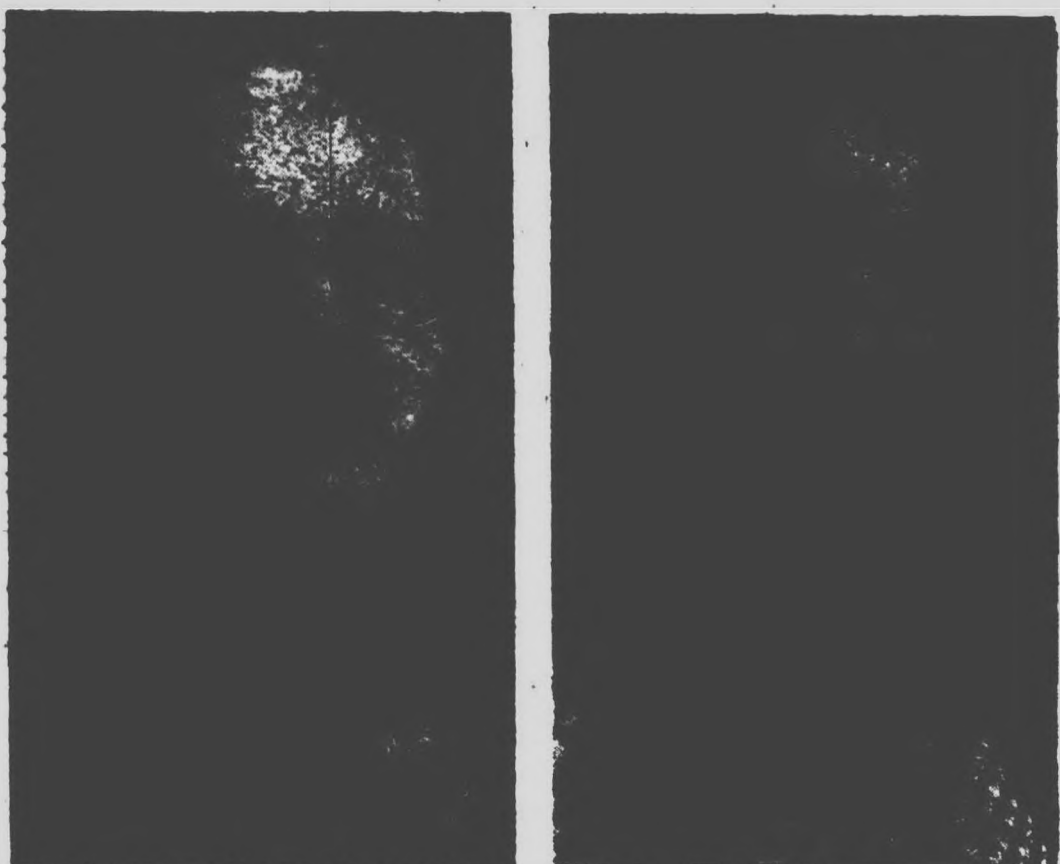
corridor is still under construction and cannot therefore qualify as "congested."

Pursell said that criterion "isn't planning." He said SEMCOG should consider developing a rapid transit line as the area develops rather than waiting for the freeway to become congested first.

He likened the criterion to the habit of building a subdivision, then busing

children to a distant school because no neighborhood school has been built yet.

After the formal presentations, local officials and the public may make their comments. It is suggested persons who wish to comment put the details in writing to assure their views will be conveyed, and then keep their oral comments to a brief outline so everyone may be heard.

## Scouts will collect clothing for Goodwill

will warehouse. The vehicles were loaned by trucking and business firms and the drivers are volunteers from the Teamsters' Union.

The drive is vital to the handicapped workers because collections of useable materials are traditionally at a minimum during the winter months. Materials collected by the Scouts keep the production lines rolling. Collections have also fallen off due to economic conditions.

Scouts ask material in their collection be confined to clothing and small items. Pick up of large items such as furniture may be arranged by calling for a Goodwill truck pick up at a later date.

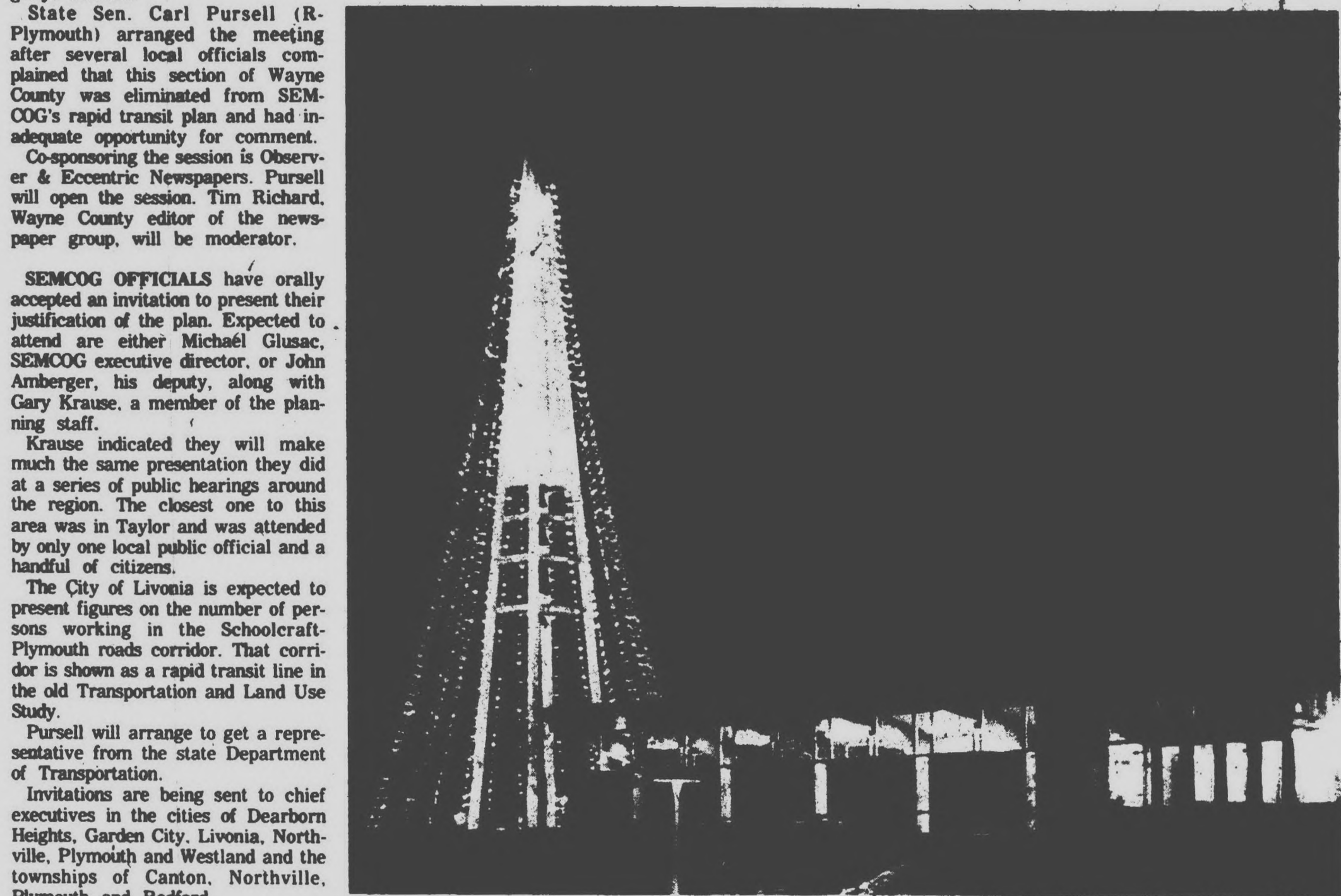

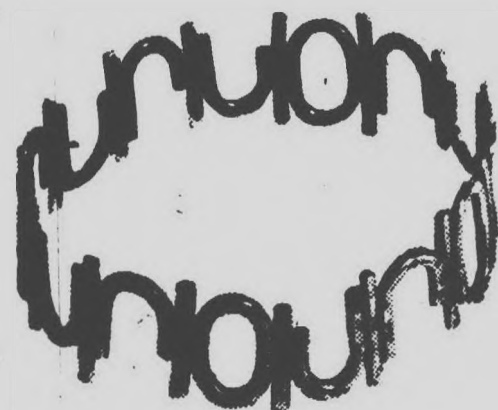

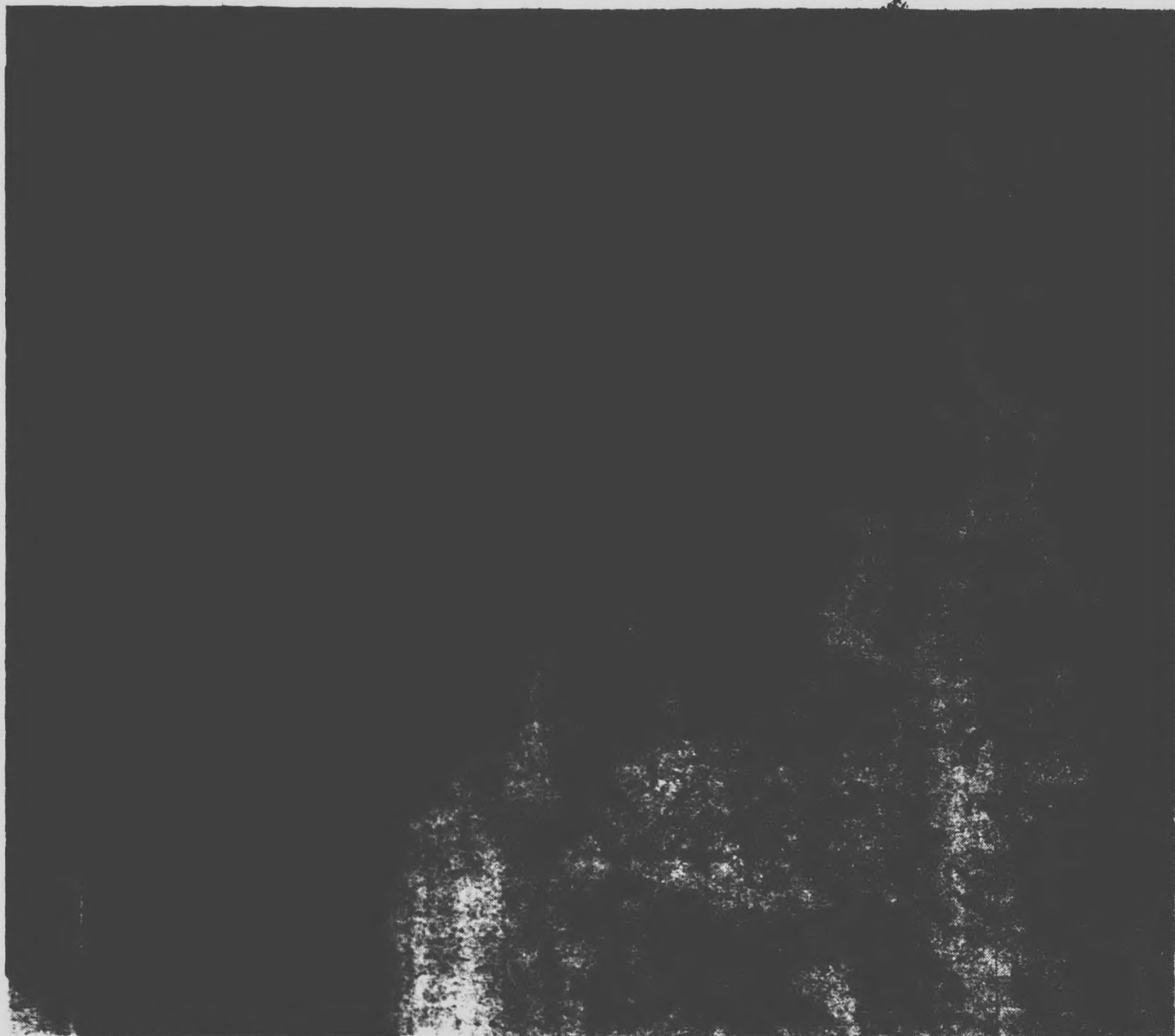

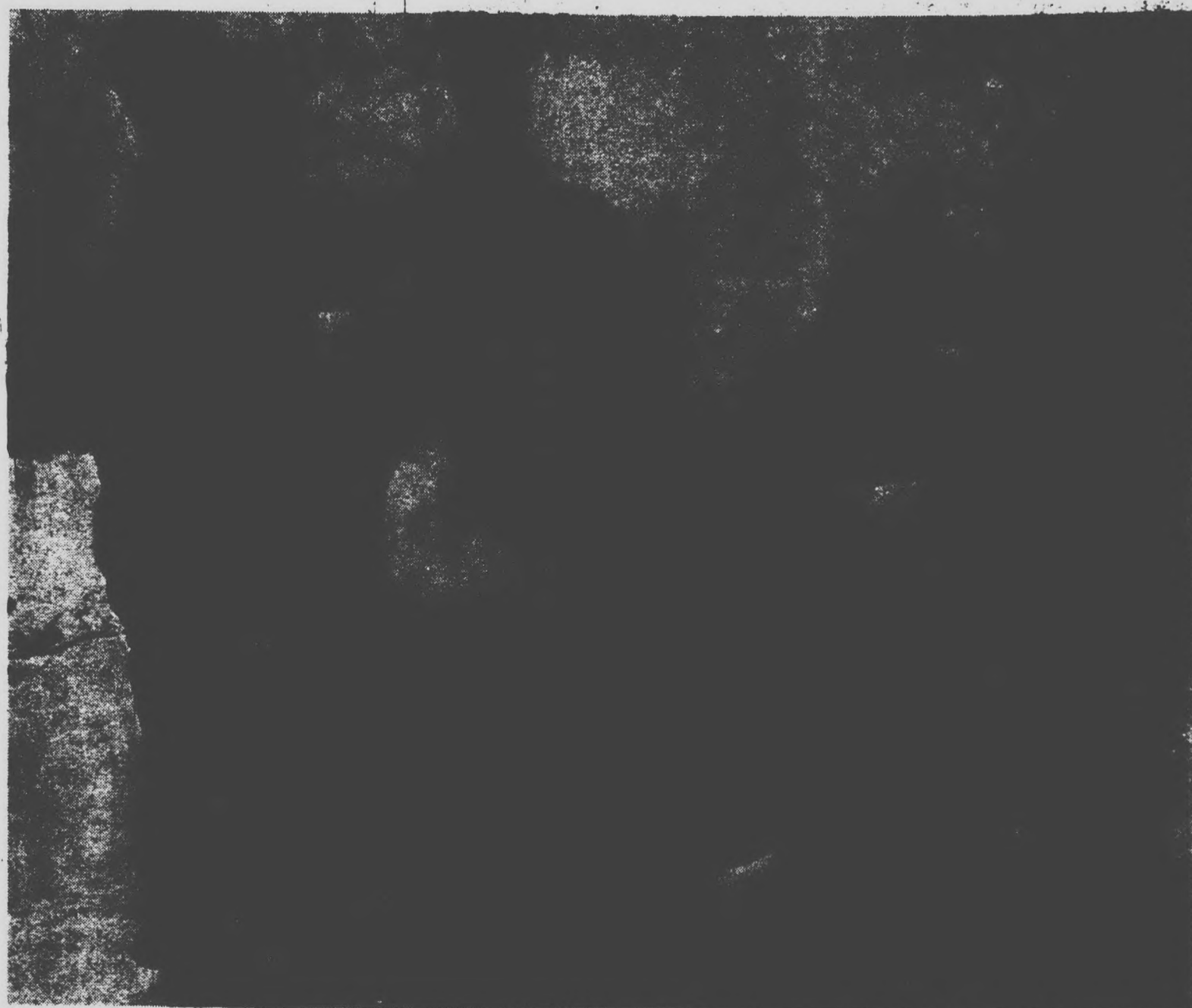

## Meter reading in township begins Dec. 9

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—The Plymouth Township Water and Sewer Department will begin reading water meters inside the home Dec. 9.

If residents are not at home when the meter reader arrives, he will leave a stamped, self-addressed card which should be filled out with the readings which appear on the inside meter, and dropped in the mail.

This procedure will be done in the future at random, but once every year, to make sure the outside meter agrees with the inside meter.

Residents worried about intruders should ask the meter readers for credentials. All Plymouth Township Department of Public Works employees are provided with picture identification cards.

were stuck in the parking lots and just wandering around the center, not exactly sure on where they were going."

ALTHOUGH THE night's escapade took on a generally humorous tone, the ten security personnel also came to the rescue in some situations which could have been fatal.  
In one case, a 62-year-old woman

was found laying unconscious in the parking lot. She was revived, outfitted with a dry set of clothing and joined with the other shoppers gathered in the auditorium.

Realizing the group would have to be bedded down and fed for the evening, a confiscation squad was formed to perform a mission which can only be described as a shopper's dream. Wilson and his colleagues were quick to reassure the temporary residents

the bill would be on the center.

"In a case like this when people are afraid and unsure of themselves, money doesn't really mean much. I was really glad we could help out these people."

Among the items collected for the night's bivouac were eight pounds of coffee, ten pounds of corned beef, six color televisions, ten pounds of ham, gallons of pop, swiss chess and checker boards.

"We figured it would be good to have some entertainment. There was even an all-night checker's tournament," says Wilson. "Some young girl won, but I can't remember her name."

"Some of these items are a bit strange," Wilson laughingly admits as he looks at bills for a package of cigars, breath mints and two bars of soap.

Also included on the list were air mattresses, blankets and pillows. But, the coup d'etat was a bill for \$50 for the purchase of ten pizzas.

It wasn't long before a sign was erected welcoming new refugees to the "Westland Hilton." Some persons stranded on the surrounding streets also sought refuge in the center, according to Wilson.

"THE BIGGEST morale booster was when our guests saw on television those persons stranded on I-94.

Everyone, all of sudden, felt grateful."

As in all good "hotels" a presidential suite was erected which required a vote of the occupants to determine who would be the lucky person to use it. The suite, in reality the only cot available, went to a youngster by a voice vote.

Meanwhile on the outside, maintenance men worked with four trucks plows for 10 1/2 hours to clear the parking lot. A bill of \$800 was racked up in towing fees.

At 7:15 a.m. on Monday the guests began to filter out in hopes of getting home.

"I'm glad the night turned into fun for those folks. It could have been grim. One thing for sure, though, I'm glad I stopped the raiding party from invading the wine cellar at the center. We might still be here," Wilson laughingly comments.

velopment of two plans the township will have "staged growth" to result in "better planning."

Manore also strongly recommends developing an entirely new zoning ordinance, rather than a thorough amending of the old version which would be "too complicated." The zoning ordinance would be composed of both a written text and a map of the township.

Bart Berg and Flossie Tonda of the planning commission were the first to voice concern over Manore's tentative completion dates. Said Berg: "I think we can do this a lot faster and we ought to." Most members of the board and the commission were in agreement.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein suggested "a weekend retreat" to hash out particulars of the plan and formulate a goal and policy statement. This "retreat" may take place in February so development of the plan can be expedited.

MANORE EMPHASIZES the first order of business is development of a goal statement.

Without goals he cannot work on the land use plan or the zoning ordinance. He suggests using recommendations from the Citizens Advisory Council as a foundation for a policy statement, with input coming from both the board and planning commission.

The final version of the land use plan will be voted on by the planning commission, while the township board will decide the fate of the zoning ordinance. This is one reason why both groups are jointly engaged in developing the new plan.

Manore hopes to add a third party to the discussion. He wants to develop a fulltime citizen council, somewhat like the old advisory council to help draft and discuss land use possibilities. He will meet with interested residents Dec. 12 at 7:45 p.m. in the township fire hall.

Until the new master land use plan is completed, however, several zoning

changes will be considered by the board and commission so that according to Manore, "the intent of the new plan won't be violated before it is even finished."

## Killeen selected as county clerk

James R. Killeen has been named to become Wayne County Clerk, effective Jan. 1 when Clerk Joseph B. Sullivan assumes a circuit judgeship to which he was elected in November.

Killeen, a personnel supervisor with the U.S. Department of Justice in Detroit, was named clerk by a majority of the 28-judge circuit court bench. He was among 21 candidates for the clerk's post which pays \$32,000 annually. Two years remain on the four-year term of office to which Sullivan was elected.

Killeen, 53, is the brother of County Commissioner George F. Killen (D-Detroit) and a resident of Grosse Pointe Farms.

Killeen says he will work to eliminate the record-keeping problems in the clerk's office which stimulated a letter in which the president of the Detroit Bar Association urged the new clerk be chosen on a basis of "professional competency."

Killeen has been with the justice department for 25 years, the last 15 of them in Detroit.

GOURLAY, secretary-treasurer of the Metropolitan Detroit AFL-CIO

Council, was sworn into office Nov. 29.

As provided by state law, he was appointed by a panel consisting of Willis Ward, presiding judge of probate court, William L. Cahalan, prosecuting attorney, and County Clerk Sullivan.

Sumeracki, 58, retired two years short of completing his six-year term after 26 years on the three-member Board of County Auditors.

Gourlay, 47, was born in Detroit and now lives in Trenton.

Schoolcraft's winter semester runs from Jan. 7 through April 25. The college serves residents of Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Plymouth and Northville school districts.

Resident tuition is \$11 per credit hour with out-of-district students paying \$22 per credit hour. All students are charged a 50 cent per hour activity fee.

## Child Development recommendation due next month

Sixteen groups in Wayne County, with ideas including a farming project, an art academy and a university campus, have submitted proposals for future uses of the old Child Development Center in Northville Township.

A committee evaluating the proposals is expected to report its recommendations to the Wayne County Board of Commissioners in January.

Once a facility for mentally retarded children, the center was closed in October and the board of commissioners established a special citizen's committee to recommend best new uses for the 800-acre complex.

MEMBERS OF the committee evaluating the proposals are:

Francis Bennett of the county planning commission; M. H. Ashley, buildings division of the County Auditors; Mrs. Modesta Gamble, Michigan League of Women Voters; and Eugene Guido, Local 1659 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME).

Also: Olga Madar, UAW-Coalition of Labor Union Women; Joseph Seavey, State Department of Natural Resources; Norman Stockmeyer, Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce and outgoing member of Wayne State University Board of Governors; Mrs. Mary Williams, Detroit Department of Recreation; and Lawrence Wright, supervisor of Northville Township.

Proposals either to buy or lease space or buildings were invited from all county agencies, educational institutions and all 43 municipalities in the county.

SCHOOLCRAFT COLLEGE in Livonia and Wayne State University would like to form a consortium and use the center as a campus extension, offering degrees from both schools.

One plan would grow low-cost food for a cooperative of residents in the Jefferson-Chalmers neighborhood in Detroit. The idea is in a plan of the Jefferson-Chalmers Citizens District Council and Project Redirection, which wants to establish a "model rural community," including vocational training and cultural exchange programs.

Another plan submitted by the State of Michigan proposes a year-round arts academy, "similar to Interlochen," for poor children. Currently the program operates in summer only and needs a permanent location, according to the proposal.

Other proposals for school uses were submitted by Northville School District, which wants vacant land for future buildings; The New Morning School, a private elementary school in Northville; and the Plymouth Montessori School.

The City of Northville proposes to lease the center's recreational facilities

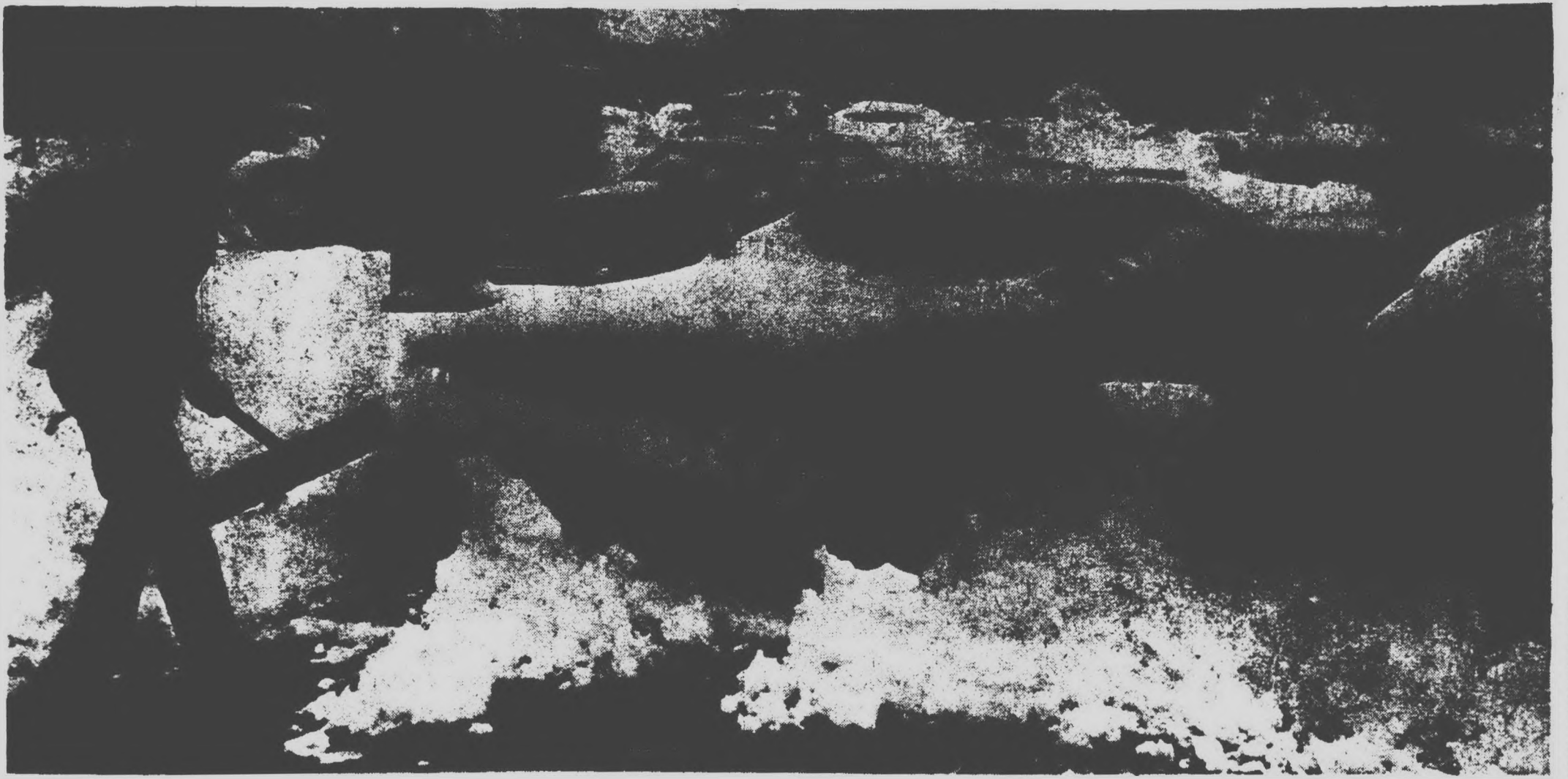
which include gymnasium and swimming pool, and Northville Township is asking for one building to house a library.

THE COUNTY PLANNING commission proposed a variety of uses for the center, among them being a Juvenile Court branch and detention center.

Also among the proposals is a plan from the Sheriff's Department to use one building as headquarters for the Metro Narcotics Squad and a chemistry laboratory.

A plan from the Detroit-Wayne County Community Mental Health Services (Act 54) Board would provide recreation for handicapped children and adults.

Another plan from SILCOM, a non-profit housing corporation funded by the Michigan State Housing Development Authority, would construct facilities for housing and educating the deaf.

In an unprecedented move, Madison Heights has voted to rejoin the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

This is the first time a governmental unit has voted to rejoin SEMCOG. The city withdrew in 1970 after one year of membership.

Madison Heights Mayor Virginia Solberg says the city decided to rejoin because of its particular interests in transportation, housing and criminal justice.



## Year's hunting is successful

Golfers and tennis players are heading indoors, but these days are some of the best of the year for hunters.

As of today, we don't have a count on the deer kill in the season that just ended, but conservation officers say success was higher than average in Michigan's prime areas.

You may think of the northland as the place to hunt, but once again the southern counties are producing the biggest deer. Hunters who got permission to work on private farmland got some big bucks in Livingston, Ingham, Jackson, Calhoun, Branch and Hillsdale counties.

RABBIT HUNTERS were doing very well around Holly and Rose townships in Oakland County, even before the Thanksgiving Day snow.

Wayne County rabbit hunters, too, are beginning to report some success.

Although the regular duck season has ended, hunters with deep-water rigs will be able to take advantage of the bonus scaup season on designated waters. The Detroit River below Grosse Ile has large rafts of lesser scaup. Many canvasback and rehead ducks are still around Michigan, but only scaup are legal in the late season, so hunters should take care in identifying their targets.

## Esch supports bill to attack unemployment

In an effort to fight unemployment in several ways, U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) is urging Congressional and union leaders to join in a bi-partisan push for legislation before the Christmas adjournment.

Esch has asked Speaker Carl Albert and labor leaders George Meany and Leonard Woodcock to support the attack.

ESCH, ranking GOP member of the House manpower subcommittee, proposes speedy congressional action on a program to pay up to 13 weeks of benefits to unemployed workers who have exhausted their state unemployment benefits and up to 26 weeks to other qualified workers lacking state unemployment insurance protection.

In letters to Albert, Meany and Woodcock, the congressman said: "We must provide major additional funds for public service jobs during the next two years. Whether this is done through separate authorizing legislation or merely through additional funds channeled through Title II of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973, we must provide relief for the unemployed."

Noting suggestions that unemployment compensation programs may be delayed due to a jurisdictional dispute involving the Ways and Means Committee, Esch said: "We certainly cannot let our unemployed languish while committee chairmen fight about jurisdiction. Our nation's unemployed deserve much more than that."

"THE HOUSE Education and Labor Committee and the Appropriations Committee can move now on more money for public service jobs."

"Moreover, I personally do not care whether the Ways and Means Committee or the Labor Committee moves on increased unemployment compensations, but action certainly must come before Christmas."

"If Chairman Wilbur Mills of the Ways and Means Committee is not going to push for this unemployment assistance program in the pending legislation, then our Labor Committee must assume the task."

Saying that Congress could act affirmatively and effectively on the problem before Christmas, Esch expressed his belief the administration is ready to work cooperatively to assure American workers can face the new year without the current degree of uncertainty.

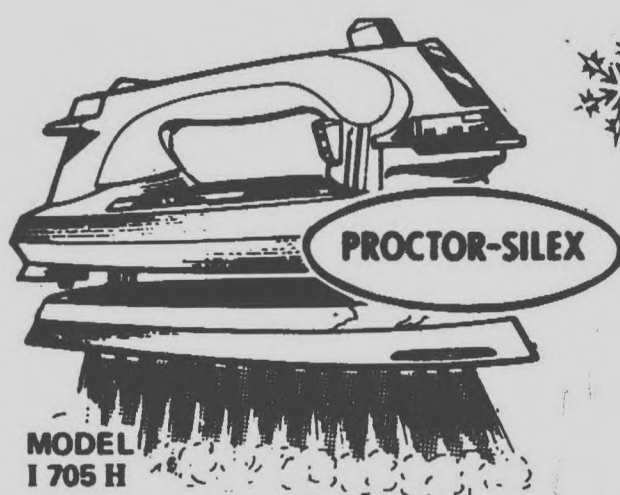

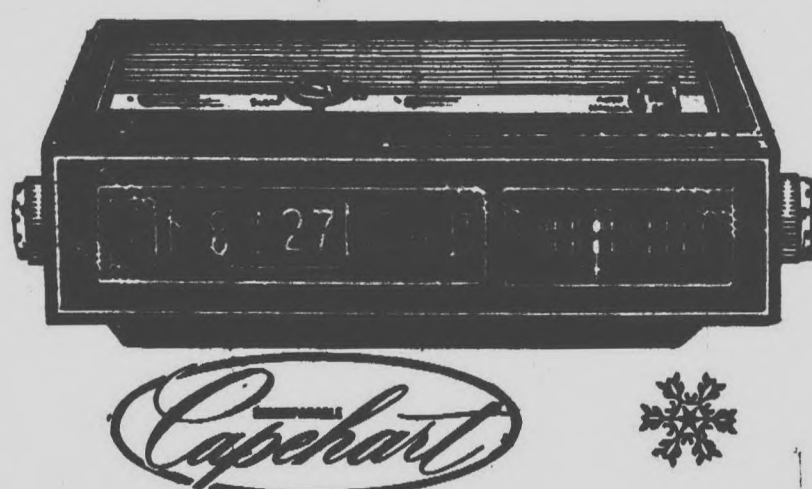

# Economic bright spots indicate recession shift

Although the economy in seems to be growing gloomier as each week passes, there are some bright spots to be found and some indicators of a speedup in 1975.

With the current rounds of auto company layoffs, the economy in the metropolitan Detroit area is apt to remain gloomy during December. But forces now at work may lead to growth beginning in January. If so, then the recession will bottom out before Christmas and then begin its recovery.

**INDICATORS CHECKED** by the Observer & Eccentric were new car dealers, mortgage availability for the housing industry, and fluctuations in the classified advertisement use of these newspapers.

Traditionally, classified ads begin to decrease in volume at the inception of a recession and conversely pick up in volume before the recovery process begins. Classifieds, thus, are a signal of a looming recession or good times to come.

An analysis of the classified section of this newspaper shows the total number of ads remained stable between 1969 and 1970 when the national economy was in a "mini-recession." The classified total jumped upwards by about 20 per cent in 1971 over 1970, but increased by only 7.5 per cent in 1972.

Total classifieds remained below 1971's boom with a 12½ per cent increase from 1972 to '73 with the recession creeping upon us. Between 1973-74, total classifieds increased by 5½ per cent. The 73-74 increase was computed after making adjustments for the merger of the Observer Newspapers and Eccentric Newspapers during the past year.

What is occurring within segments of the economy can be observed by studying individual categories within the classified section. There has been an increase, for instance, in the number of garage and rummage sale insertions. Used car listings has also increased with more "sale by owner" ads. There has been a significant increase since last spring in the "home for sale by owner" ads.

**NEW CAR DEALERS** in the suburbs are optimistic 1975 will be a better sales year than last year once potential buyers overcome the current shock of temporary plant shutdowns and layoffs.

The dealers point out that now is a good time to buy a new car because it can be obtained at a lower price as higher trade-ins are being offered for 1971-73 models in good shape.

Now is a good time to buy because dealers have cars in stock ready for immediate delivery, says Lou LaRiche, Chevrolet dealer in Plymouth.

If the used car is clean and in good condition, he adds, it is worth more now than it was six or seven months ago.

"There is a tremendous market now to buy used cars which gives the dealer a greater incentive (and ability) to offer a better trade-in deal. We know the used car will move faster on our used car lots and will sell for a profit. With the nature of our business, it is natural then we will offer more to buy a used car on a trade-in."

LaRiche says the pattern has been for prior year cars to drop \$1,000 in value as soon as the new models are introduced. "But this hasn't taken place this year, which is a situation we've never faced before."

He adds that an upturn in consumer confidence won't occur until the inflationary spiral is cut into, and automobile dealerships are now doing this.

**ED BROWN** of Bill Brown Ford, Livonia, reports the same situation exists at his dealerships — the higher trade-in value of '71-73 cars has offset the increased price for 1975s.

"Used cars are at a premium now and so it costs less to finance a new car than at any time in the past two

years — especially with the medium and larger-size cars of model years '71, '72 and '73.

"There is a little upswing in new car sales now. But people need jobs to buy new cars and a layoff of one person scares another 10."

He adds there is also a demand for 1970-72 compacts. "The premium demand is for cars in the \$2,000-\$2,500 price range, and it doesn't really matter what kind it is."

Brown has an added incentive to potential car buyers in that he has about 120 "new" 1974 models whose prices have dropped with the introduction of the '75 models. "Here's where some real bargains are."

**DOMINIC MARINO** of Colony Chrysler-Plymouth in Plymouth joins his GM and Ford counterparts in offsetting higher prices for new cars by offering higher trade-in value.

Money is tight, he adds, which prevents a buyer with a \$200-\$300 down payment from financing a loan for a new car. But the buyer with a two-year-old car worth \$2,000-\$2,500 has a large enough down payment to secure a bank loan.

Another advantage today in financing new cars, Marino says, is that the buyer can now obtain a loan for 48 months instead of the previous maximum of 36 months. "Dealers in the City of Detroit are having problems. But my dealership, and most of the dealers I've talked to in the suburbs, have had a better new car sales month in November than in October."

He believes this pick up is due to the better trade-ins which dealers can offer.

Marino added that he has about 30 '74usters in stock. "That's surprising because we expected the Duster to sell better than other models because of last year's energy crunch."

**EVEN MORE** promising are drops in the home mortgage rates the week of Nov. 18.

Conventional home loans took a half per cent drop with savings & loans dipping to 9½. On Nov. 26, Michigan Bank lowered its home mortgage interest rate to 9½ per cent.

Mike Samonek of United Northwest Realtors Association, Farmington Hills, predicts the home mortgage rate will continue to decline until next spring when it will level off at 8½ per cent. The drop will be much faster in savings & loan institutions, he added, because 90 per cent of their loans are home mortgages.

"If people keep on saving money, and deposits in savings & loans increases, the rate will continue downward and more mortgage money will become available."

Samonek says he expects "points" charged to obtain a home loan will remain the same, and might come down a bit. "Money is loosening up. Nationwide, the recession has hit bottom although it hasn't yet in this area. Money will become more available during 1975."

Samonek said Realtors and home lenders have been taking a hard look at the point system and will keep points down to the extent the money supply allows. "Points are controlled by the demand for money. The higher the demand, the more likely points will rise. Unfortunately, savings and loans take it on the chin because of government requirements."

**NEW CONSTRUCTION** of homes can be expected next year, he added, because the federal government will be pumping money into both into new home construction and used home mortgaging and rehabilitation.

The money to rehabilitate used homes is especially vital in Detroit, he said, where HUD has 16,000 homes costing the taxpayer about \$120,000 a day just to maintain.

New money pumped into the used house market would, Samonek says,

help the economy by getting more people into houses, get rid of the \$100,000 a day maintenance drain for HUD houses, and encourage homeowners to sell their houses and purchase either new homes or more expensive used houses.

In summary, Samonek expects 1975 will be a much better year than '74. "Our economic policies will begin to pay off if people don't panic. If you look hard enough, you can see spooks behind every corner. But you can also see cause for hope and all indicators now point towards an economic recovery."

**ON A LARGER SCALE**, optimism is also expressed by Thomas A. Murphy, vice-chairman of General Motors Corp.

An example, Murphy points to inflation. "World market prices for copper, aluminum, textiles, lumber, steel scrap, lead, zinc and other industrial materials are declining — and have been for some time."

"Domestic prices have already begun to reflect this trend. The Bureau of Labor Standards' index of 13 industrial materials, for example, has registered a 15 per cent decrease since mid-July."

"Regarding world oil prices, I think we can look for some stability, if not improvement. Certainly, there is no reason to expect a repetition of the four-fold increase which was such a significant factor in raising ALL costs during the first nine months of this year."

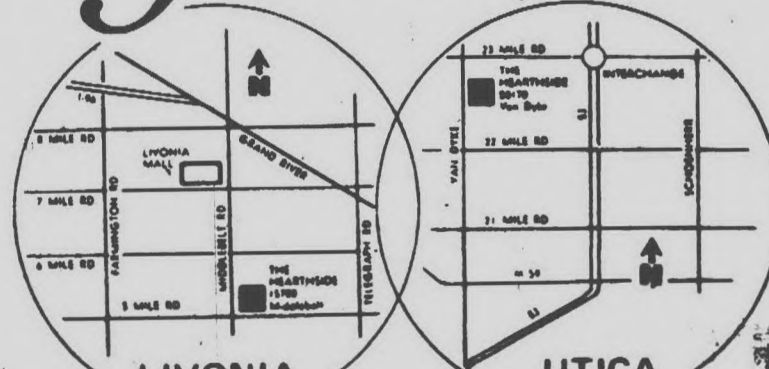

# County eyes ticket settlement by mail

A resolution permitting motorists to settle defective equipment tickets by mail was recently approved by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners and forwarded to the State Legislature.

The proposal, recommended by the General Government Committee whose members include Richard E. Manning (D-Redford) and Brian G. Arrowsmith (D-Canton Township), urges the waiver of the fine be mandatory upon receipt of proof of repair.

Commissioner Edward K. Michalski (D-Detroit) who introduced the resolution said, "Usually, when the motorist appears on his court date and reports the repair has been made, the judge waives the fine. But it might be necessary for the motorist to return to a place hundreds of miles from his home for the court appearance. I believe the whole thing could be handled just as well by mail, and help unclog our crowded court dockets in the process."

IN ORDER to continue the present Juvenile Facilities Network (JFN) program which is a countywide series of programs that encompass not only crime prevention, but rehabilitation of those who have been adjudicated. In addition to maintaining three centers, Highland Park, Inkster and the East Side, the program has 26 separate projects including films, presentations in the Livonia schools and a Saturday academic program at Madonna College.

To maintain the program, the Board of Commissioners recently authorized the JFN to submit a grant application to the Department of Health Education and Welfare (HEW) for \$400,000 for the period from Dec. 1, 1974 to June 30, 1975. It requires county matching funds of \$133,334. Commissioners also authorized the JFN to revise a previously approved Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) grant from \$1 million to \$1.05 million for a year beginning Dec. 1.

The first grant application of \$400,000 will be used to support four current projects, two new ones and seven youth workers, a planner, five youth service workers and a gang worker on the east side. These are currently financed from a LEAA grant which expires the end of November.

COMMISSIONER Mary Dumas (R-Livonia) says of the grant application situation: "Right now, we are in a 60-day hold on the extension. We are trying to get \$500,000 back in the budget which the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council took out. We've got to find ways to find \$500,000."

One of the problems she mentions is that the majority of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council, of which she is a member, are from Detroit.

"Our hassle," Mrs. Dumas says, "has not been with the Board of Commissioners, but the Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee because we do want to see greater program

money going into overall countywide programs."

ALONG WITH THIS recommendation from the Human Resources Committee, another was given final approval, an assistance program for troubled county employees at a first year cost of \$55,407.

Commissioner Tom Taylor (D-Westland), chairman of the human resources committee, proposed the troubled employee program.

Taylor cited the savings in employee absenteeism due to emotional problems and substance abuse as justification for the expenditure.

The board also approved a formula for the distribution of \$2.5 million in Title II funds for the public service intern program among 40 cities and communities in the county.

Because of their size, Livonia, Detroit and Dearborn receive direct grants.

Other local portions of the grant are: Westland, \$153,541; Canton Township, \$25,497; Plymouth Township, \$40,943; Plymouth, \$31,257; Garden City, \$97,146 and Redford Township, \$179,827.

The funds were made available by Congress through a supplemental appropriation requested by President Gerald Ford. One of the provisions of the program is the hiring of local residents for the training program at an \$8,000 a year salary each and help with job placement once the training is completed.

## Freon dangers may evoke ban on aerosols

Aerosol sprays and other household products which discharge fluorocarbon gases or Freon, a trade name, may become tomorrow's antiques.

Representatives Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) and Paul G. Rogers (D-Fla.) are drafting legislation to permit the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to ban the products, if studies by the National Academy of Sciences and others substantiate the suspected danger. Esch represents the 2nd District which includes Livonia and Plymouth.

THE LEGISLATION would amend the Clean Air Act and require manufacturers of any product which in normal use discharges fluorocarbons to obtain a certificate of safety from the EPA if the health hazard is established. Refrigerators and air conditioners use fluorocarbons for cooling, but normally don't discharge the chemical.

The two congressmen said in a joint statement: "The warnings from the National Academy of Sciences and other scientists who have conducted independent research indicate a potentially dangerous situation.

"We feel that hearings should be held to determine the severity of the situation and what steps should be taken," Rogers and Esch said. "We have not called for an immediate and total ban. That would be pre-judging on the basis of limited evidence. But there is little doubt that if the evidence does hold up, a ban may be necessary."

HEARINGS ARE tentatively scheduled to start Dec. 11 before the House Subcommittee on Public Health and Environment.

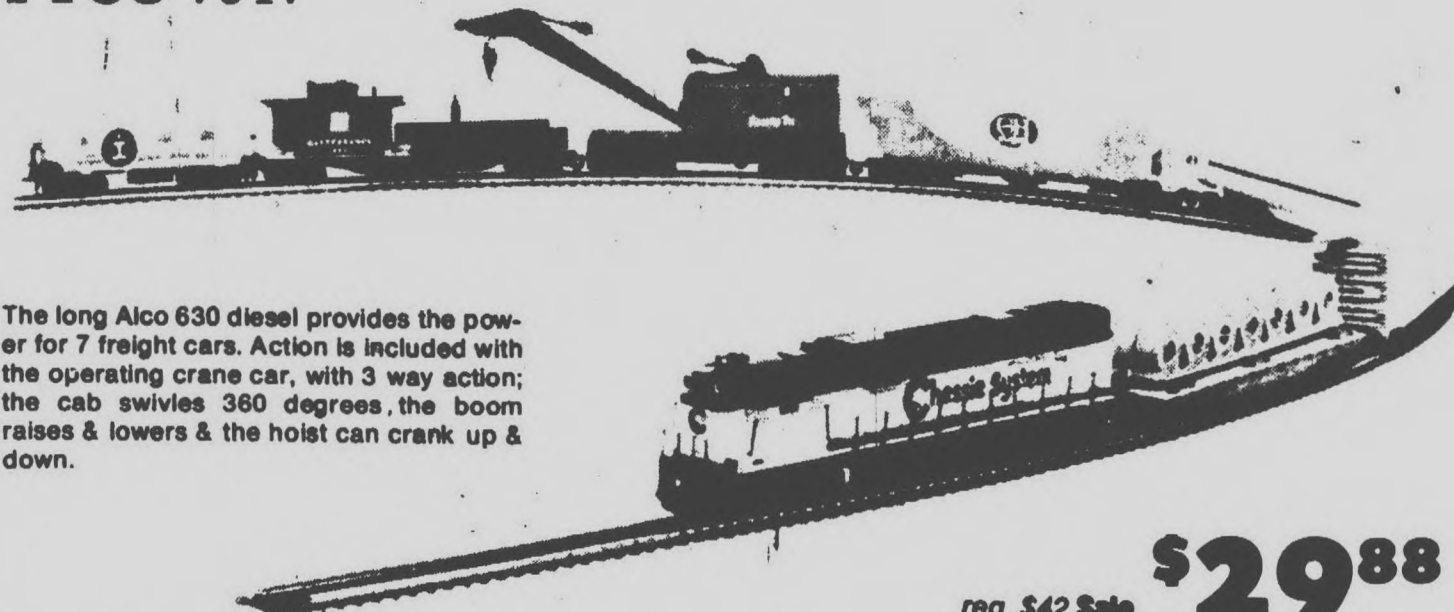
Studies indicate that fluorocarbon gases rise in the atmosphere and par-

tially destroy the ozone layer which shields the earth from cancer-causing ultraviolet rays. The fluorocarbons broken down by radiation in the stratosphere form free chlorine atoms which will increasingly destroy ozone and trigger an increase in skin cancer due to the increased ultraviolet radiation which the ozone normally would absorb.

Esch said: "We are drawing no conclusions about the warnings of risk to health at this time. However, we are calling upon the scientific community to provide Congress and the public with the facts so that if a risk is proven we can take the proper steps."

An estimated 2.9 billion aerosol and pressurized products were manufactured in the United States in 1973, but it is not known precisely what percentage of aerosols contain fluorocarbon gasses.

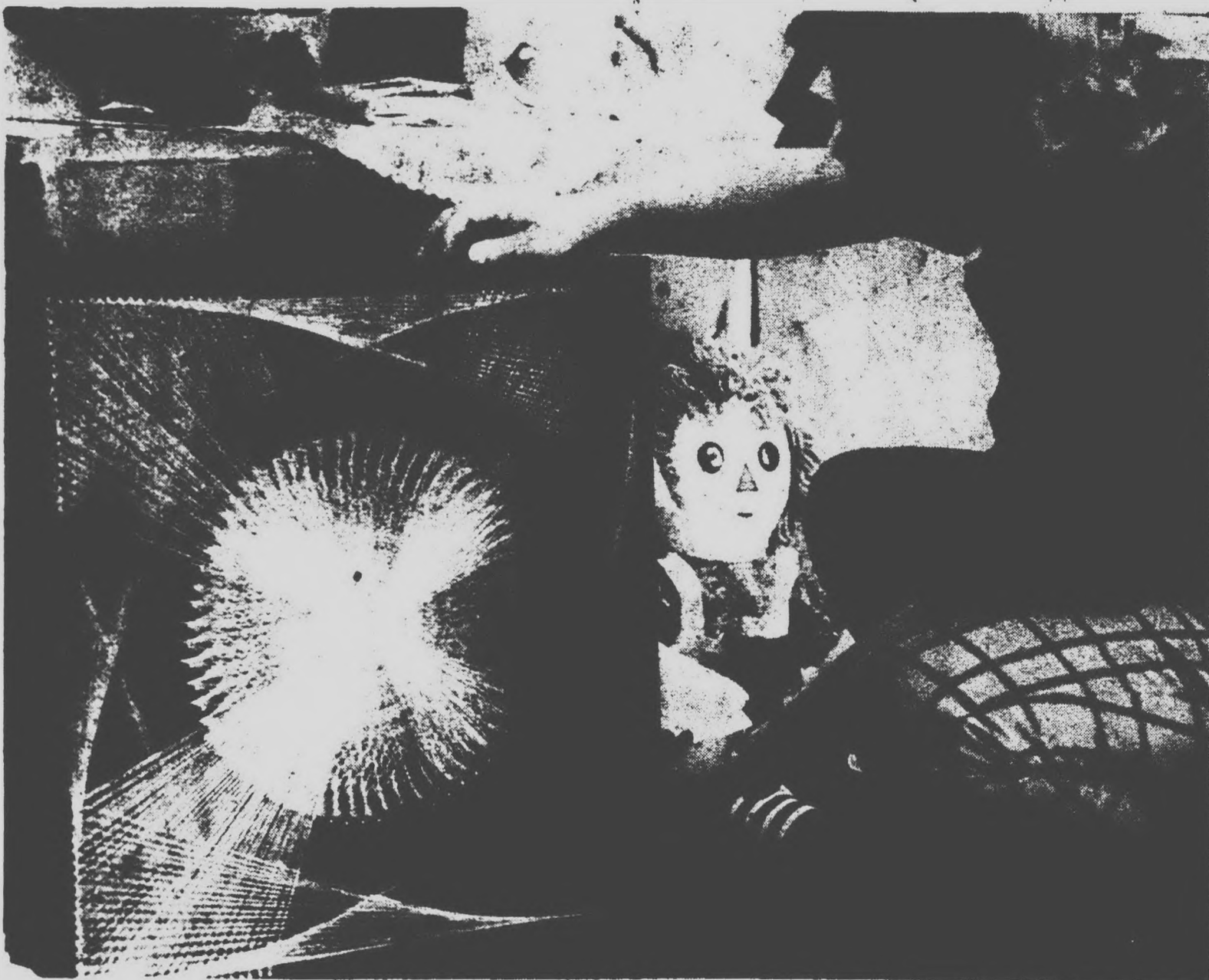
All are partially funded by the Juliette Low World Fellowship Fund, which three million Girl Scouts contribute to each year.

# Bennett urges aerosol ban

State Rep. John Bennett (D-Redford Township) is among three cosponsors of a bill to stop production of Freon gas commonly used in aerosol spray cans and other products.

Other sponsors of the bill introduced in the House are Rep. Perry Bullard (D-Ann Arbor) and Rep. Warren Gómaere (D-Roseville).

CITING THE RECENT scientific discovery of the potential health and environmental hazards of the gas, Bullard introduced the bill which would ban production and sale in Michigan of such products.

Simultaneous findings by several scientific teams indicate the gas may be destroying the protective ozone layer

of the earth's atmosphere at a rapid rate.

The ozone layer filters out the dangerous ultraviolet light rays. Depletion of this ozone filter would lead to enormous increases in skin cancer, some scientists report, plus worldwide destruction of crops, and major changes in weather and climate conditions around the world.

Bullard says his bill and other moratorium actions would be strongly opposed by the corporations which produce and use the gas in their products.

"They claim the evidence isn't all in yet. However, the problem is that scientists say by the time the evidence is conclusive, if they are right and the current rate of production has

continued, it will be too late to prevent the disastrous effects.

"For example, a worldwide increase in skin cancer of possibly 15 to 20 per cent would be expected.

"This is a clear case of the public interest being opposed by the corporate interest in more profits and it is past time for us to start putting people above profits in our priority system."

The bill has been referred to the House Committee on Conservation and Recreation.

IN A RELATED action in Michigan, the Clean Air Movement (CAM) has announced in Detroit a call for a boycott by consumers of spray cans and other products so as to reduce the market demand and thus the production of Freon.

Bullard urges concerned persons to contact CAM at POB 05036 for ways to help in the contact.

Similar legislative action is being considered in other states — notably New York where the attorney general's consumer division is looking into the possibility of sponsoring state legislation.

On the national level, the Natural Resources Defense Council (a private group of 13,000 members) has filed a petition with the federal Consumer Products Safety Commission asking for a national ban on spray cans which use Freon.

# Malpractice settlements drive out doctors

Thousands of ailing persons in southeastern Michigan may find it impossible to find a doctor within a year and perhaps sooner unless major steps are taken to ease the pressures caused by the medical malpractice lawsuits.

More and more doctors are finding the constant threat of a malpractice suit hanging over their heads a bit more than they care to bargain with.

The only answer to the situation, which has mushroomed to astronomical proportions in recent months due to huge payoffs ordered by courts and juries after lengthy, costly trials, is to hike the malpractice insurance premiums. Practically every doctor faced with this prospect very candidly admits he can't afford the costs and can't afford not to have insurance.

Therefore, he has to drop out of private practice to less risky fields, one where he has protection provided by large corporations or by forming groups of doctors who have large enough and lucrative enough practices to share the costs.

**DISCUSSING THE SITUATION** with a few doctors at a Livonia hospital recently, we discovered that many in the specialty fields believe the premiums will go as high as \$30,000 to \$50,000 if lawsuits are decided in favor of the patient.

And when that day comes -- and many think it isn't far away -- then doctors have only two alternatives...hike fees to cover the costs of the insurance or drop out of private practice.

## You may not notice it but we change

Within only a few weeks, it will be just 14 years since the then newly appointed public relations director of the Detroit Race Course suggested to the track's hierarchy that the 1961 thoroughbred racing season be given the added opening day fanfare of a parade through downtown Livonia.

"Good thinking," mocked the DRC president and the general manager and the Lansing lobbyist. "And after you've set it up with all your bands, floats and public officials, let us know what you call downtown Livonia. You'll be the only one who knows."

**ONLY ONE WEEK** ago, this same idea guy was thinking out loud at the dinner table, suggesting that in only the last six years since the clan had moved into its home in Plymouth many changes in the face of the community had crept into being, so silently as to be mainly overlooked.

"My goodness, how you've grown," said a dotting aunt of the lithe lass who outreached her for a turkey drumstick. What she didn't realize was that her words had far greater meaning, if one chose to apply them beyond the walls of a single abode.

Some of us who report and edit the ongoing input of suburbia frequently make light of the fact that in our several sectors there are some civic debates which seem to go on ad infinitum without decisions, thus establishing ready-made issues on which our grandchildren can take their political stands.

But all about us new things are under way—some of them sociological, but most of them physically apparent if only we would take the time to see them.

**THE BEST EYES** to examine a community are those of a former resident who hasn't been back in the old home town for at least 10 years, preferably at least 20. In brief, someone who moved away from Livonia, Plymouth, Redford Township, Westland (then Nankin Township) or Garden City as early as 1954.

After he has asked of his old buddies, "What's new?" and has been answered, "Aw, nothin' much," his eyes will move around, inquisitively asking, "Where's this, where's that, where are those?" And of course, you, who were there all the time, will hedge a bit and confess that you really didn't pay much attention; it all seemed so slow.

"You can't go back," they say—and many of your elders who have sought to recapture a moment from the past will tell you it's true. But please don't ignore the even so slight changes that today has brought. Accumulatively, they are your tomorrow.

## Sense And Nonsense

The announcers on short-staffed radio stations did long and yeoman service during the recent snowstorm, but occasionally it got the better of them. One broadcaster announced that a college's exams would be held a few days later — "some time, some place." Er, make that same time, same place.

**R. T. Thompson writes**

If the latter happens, then area hospitals are going to find themselves in a real bind for top specialists. Most certainly there will be well trained MDs available, but they won't be able to practice due to the high costs of operation.

This was brought to mind in a convincing manner a few days ago when we visited a large General Motors complex in the Livonia area and learned a neurosurgeon had been hired as the plant medical doctor.

Imagine a highly skilled, highly trained person with all of the knowledge of this doctor handling, cut fingers and legs and similar accidents. Imagine what a loss it is to some hospital, which has been trying for months to induce a neurosurgeon to join its staff, to learn such a man is available but can't afford to go into private practice because he can't afford the costs of malpractice insurance.

**THERE WAS AN** incident a few weeks back where a teenager from the Flint area suffered critical head injuries in an accident. None of the neurosurgeons in that area would examine him, and he had to be rushed to one of the hospitals in the Ann Arbor area.

He died within hours of admission and prob-

ably wouldn't have survived had he been treated in Flint. Reports from there were that no doctor cared to handle the case because of the possibility of a malpractice suit. It seems that several have been burned lately, and none wanted to become a new possibility.

The crisis worsened recently when Shelby Mutual Insurance Co. announced it would stop providing medical malpractice insurance to some 2,000 generally high-risk Michigan physicians during the next three years.

More than half of the 2,000 surgeons and specialists reside in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb and Genesee counties. These are the doctors most frequently sued and few of the state's other insurance companies have been willing to sell them policies.

It is reported that those who can get insurance from other firms, are finding their \$5,000 annual premiums increased to \$20,000. Only a scant few would continue practicing without adequate insurance. Very few could continue practice without increasing fees to patients to take care of the higher premiums.

**"MEDICAL MALPRACTICE"** is when a doctor injures his patient through negligence. Although doctors are humans just as you and I, the majority of patients and their families believe he is like God and can't make a mistake.

**THERE IS**, of course, a catch, and it comes in the second act. The catch is that the men are going to apply the same job performance standards on the wives that their bosses apply to the men at work.

All wives will undergo a 90-day probation period; if "things just don't work out," the wife can be summarily fired. No divorce, no annulment, no alimony. She's fired.

That's the situation we are in right now, and it's going to get worse. We wonder how long it will be before doctors start leaving private practice. It means hospitals will be understaffed; top surgeons and specialists will take more comfortable posts with large industrial plants.

It's something that should have the attention of the medical associations, the insurance companies and the State Legislature immediately. It's a problem that can't wait too long for an answer or the sick and ailing in every nook and corner of this state are going to suffer even more.

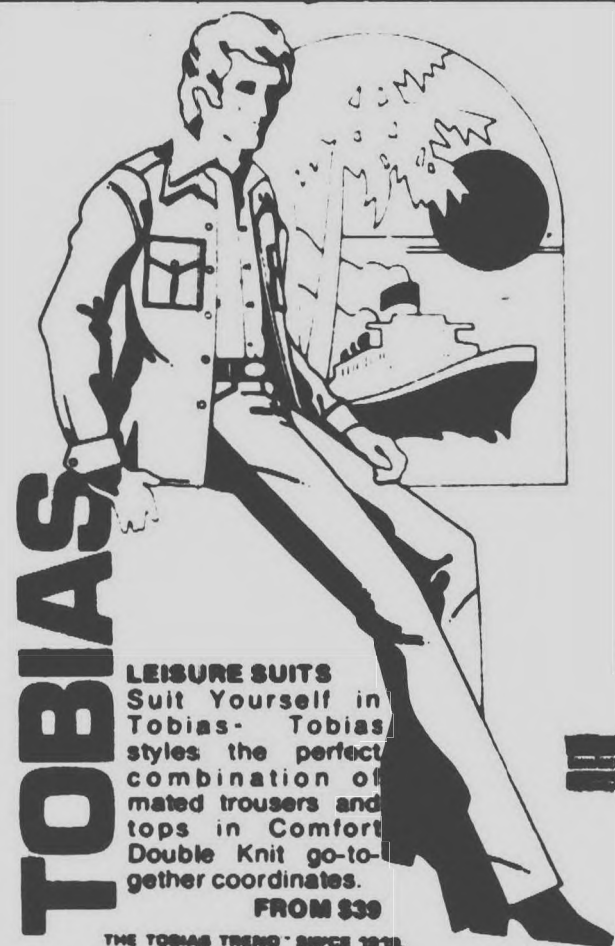

## The Goodfellow tradition

One evening more than a half century ago, Burt Thomas, one of the leading cartoonists of his time, was sitting at his desk in the Detroit News building groping for an idea.

Like many of his profession, he was hard pressed at times to come up with a suitable cartoon each day and he sat there, letting a thousand thoughts go through his mind.

Outside the wind was howling and the icy blasts from the north made life miserable on Lafayette Boulevard, and especially that part of newspaper row that was home to the News and The Detroit Free Press. It was in this stretch of Lafayette that the young and old newsboys came for their papers and began their sales. But on a night such as this they were a sad sight.

And while the wind was howling, Burt Thomas sat there, virtually "doodling," as he explained several times. Suddenly, the thought and the sight of the young news hawks trying to sell their wares on the various corners gripped him.

In no time he outlined a cartoon in which a young tattered newsboy was hailing a well-to-do gent, walking along with packages (possibly Christmas gifts) asking him to buy a paper.

Little did Burt Thomas think at the time when the cartoon appeared in the Detroit News that it would inspire a heartwarming act of charity and a tradition that has lived through the years.

But that is exactly what happened. One of the men who saw the cartoon, little Jimmy Brady, himself a

former newsboy, conceived the idea that it would be a great thing if the former newsboys would take over their old corners again, relive some of the days of their youth, and sell papers for charity—one day each year.

With this idea he organized the Old Newsboys and they gladly agreed to carry on with the slogan "No Kiddie Without A Christmas." Came the day of the gale and what a sight it was to see some of these former newsboys, now grown men, in all walks of life, standing at their favorite corners in downtown "selling" their papers again.

Nothing like it ever had been attempted before, and right there was born the tradition of the Old Newsboys and the annual "Goodfellow editions" of the newspapers.

The early sales were a bit different than those of today in that each of the old newsboys (doctors, lawyers, judges, business and industrial leaders) had their own followers and these groups came back to their former newsboy to make the purchase in the name of charity.

For instance, Al Day, a druggist who was one of the area's best boxing referees, handled the corner of State and Griswold Streets, and the sports groups drove for miles to help him boost the fund. It was a common sight to see Frank Navin, owner of the Detroit Tigers, and Jack Adams, general manager of the Detroit Red Wings, come to the corner along with many of their players. Newspapers sent special reporters to cover the corner, both with the printed word and pictures.

Sports Corner became a real tradition. When Al Day moved on to his reward, "Spike" Briggs, son of the late Tiger owner, and Judge John P. Scallen, took over. What a job these fellows did for charity!

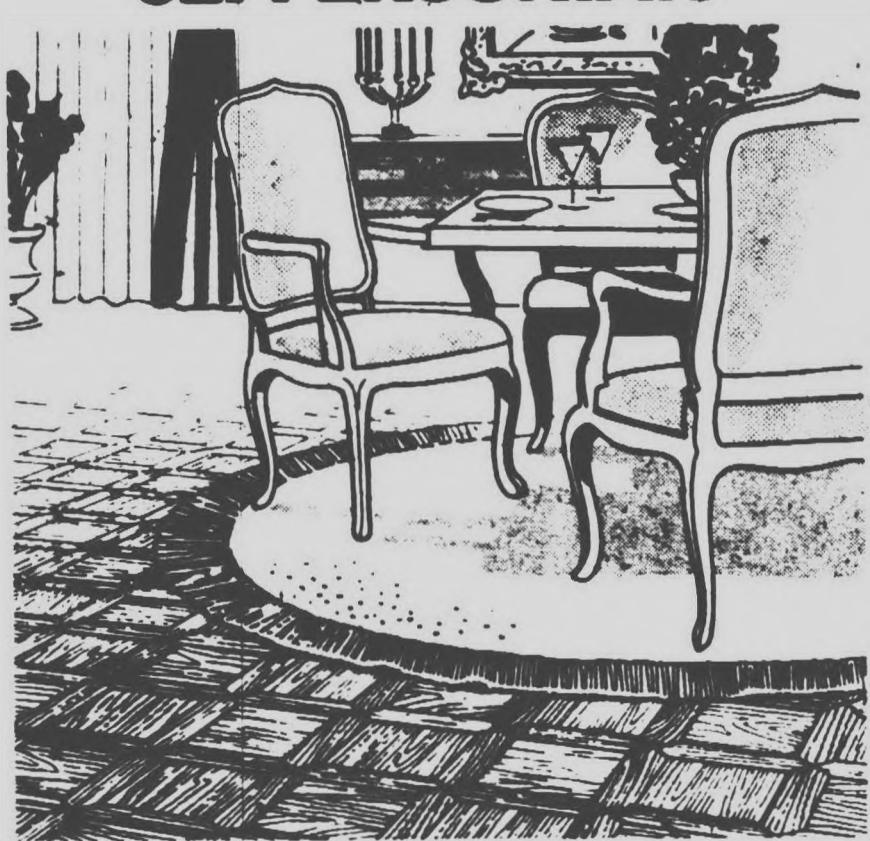
Herman Leiberman, the veteran tobacconist, took over at the corner of Woodward and Michigan where the former Majestic Building stood. He too became one of the real traditions of the day.

So strong had this tradition become that when the rush came from the city to the suburbs, the Goodfellows came with them and every township and city in the metropolitan area now has a Goodfellow paper sale with the slogan, "No Kiddie Without A Christmas."

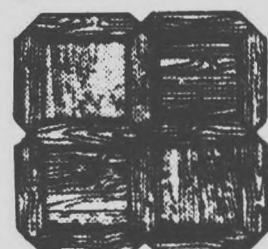
Livonia was one of the first to pick up the tradition with the organization of a Goodfellows group in 1937. Then, one by one, the others followed.

The old newsboys of the early days are gone now. In their places have come the firemen and police of the various communities to conduct the sale.

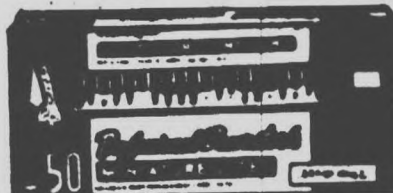

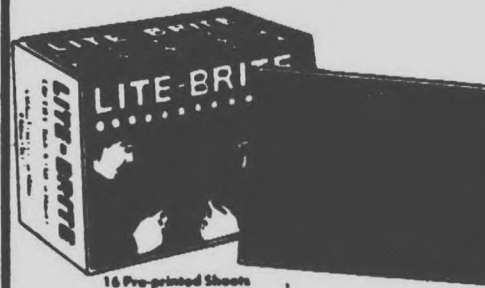

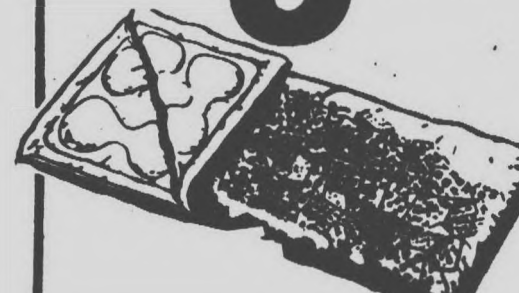

## Overcrowding increases

# State asked for jail funds

The chairman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners has urged the new leaders of the Michigan Legislature to approve his request for a loan to finance new jail facilities.

Robert E. FitzPatrick made his plea by letter as the crime rate, increasing in tandem with the unemployment rate, sent the prisoner-population of the Wayne County Jail soaring.

His letter went out on the eve of a meeting at which a three-judge circuit court panel demanded to know what was being done to bring the jail population in line with the 799-prisoner limit set by the panel in 1971.

IN RECENT MONTHS, the jail population has risen into the 800s and 900s.

FitzPatrick emphasized that the entire \$29.5 million loan sought for jail construction wouldn't be needed in a lump sum.

This was in response to a reported feeling among key legislators that the requested loan couldn't be made because the state will lose \$200 million in revenue due to repeal of the sales tax on food and prescription medicines.

FitzPatrick cited a loan schedule presented to the House and Senate appropriations committees last July by Dr. John Dempsey, Gov. Milliken's urban affairs specialist.

The schedule calls for an outlay of only \$971,250 this fiscal year and \$1.7 million for the state fiscal year starting July 1. Those funds would be repaid within 12 months.

The major state outlays would come in 1976-77 and 1977-78, with \$12.5 million being required in each of those two fiscal years. A final advance of some \$2.1 million would be needed in 1978.

The county would repay the total amount plus interest by Jan. 1, 1981.

His letter went to the four men who, by vote of their colleagues, will lead their parties in the House and Senate after Jan. 1.

These are Reps. Bobby D. Crim (D-Davison) and Dennis O. Cawthorne (R-Manistee), House majority and minority leaders, respectively, and Sens. William B. Fitzgerald (D-Detroit) and Robert W. Davis (R-Gaylord), Senate majority and minority leaders, respectively.

FitzPatrick proposed the state loan last year. A majority of voters turned down proposed jail millage in 1972.

The money would finance additional jail facilities for 350 prisoners in downtown Detroit and a 400-inmate facility in western Wayne County.

FitzPatrick notes the recent suicide

of a Dearborn youth, 17, who was being held in the overcrowded jail while awaiting state psychiatric examination.

"There are no funds available for jail construction in the normal flow of revenues from county tax funds," FitzPatrick declared in his letter. "Therefore, in order to meet this compelling need, we appeal to you and to the State Legislature to arrange for the advance of the required funds."

Presiding Recorder's Court Judge George W. Crockett Jr. cites bonding practices of some of his fellow recorder's judges as a major cause of jail overcrowding. He advocated wider use of personal bonds which don't require that any cash be put up, rather than surety bonds.

PARTICIPANTS IN the meeting

with the panel of judges said there is a conflict between Crockett and some of his fellow judges on the matter.

Richard T. Kelly, chairman of the Wayne County Board of Auditors, urged defendants be brought to trial more quickly to reduce the jail population. The jail population consists mainly of persons awaiting trial.

The judicial panel asked county officials to inspect, and report back on the feasibility of using as jail facilities, the vacant former Oakland County jail and vacant psychiatric buildings at Wayne County General Hospital in Westland.

Sheriff William Lucas told the panel he felt it would be more humane to have prisoners sleeping on floors in the Wayne County Jail than housed in the Oakland County jail.

The 799 limit on prisoners was set by the judicial panel after the panel ruled in favor of a suit brought against the county on behalf of a number of jail inmates. The suit charged the rights of the inmates were being violated by the crowded conditions and structural shortcomings of the jail.

In meeting informally with the county officials, the judicial panel adjourned a hearing at which the officials were to show cause why they shouldn't be held in contempt of court for exceeding the limit.

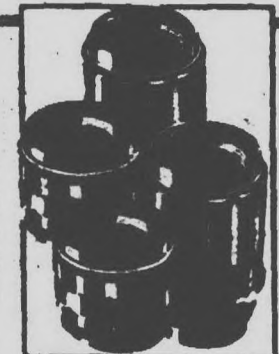

## Engineering aptitude tests slated at SC

Special engineering aptitude tests will be given on the second floor of the Waterman Center, Schoolcraft College on Haggerty north of Six Mile at 8 a.m. on Jan. 18 and Feb. 22.

Applications are available from Paul N. Rick, 41336 Crestwood Drive, Plymouth, and should be returned no later than Dec. 18.

With the supply of engineering students expected to fall short of demand for the next few years, says Rick, now could well be the time to consider a career in engineering.

C. P. Clements, chairman of the engineering preparation committee of the Michigan Society of Professional Engineers (MSPE), says the job market for current engineering graduates is bright in spite of current trends.

The overall sagging job market presents a challenge to continue to increase engineering enrollment of highly qualified students, Clements adds.

Thus, to promote engineering as a career for pre-college young people, and to help them determine if they would find satisfaction as an engineer, MSPE and some of its local chapters are sponsoring the aptitude tests.

There is no charge for the test, says Clements, which is designed to help students make curriculum choices which could lead to a degree and future as an engineer.

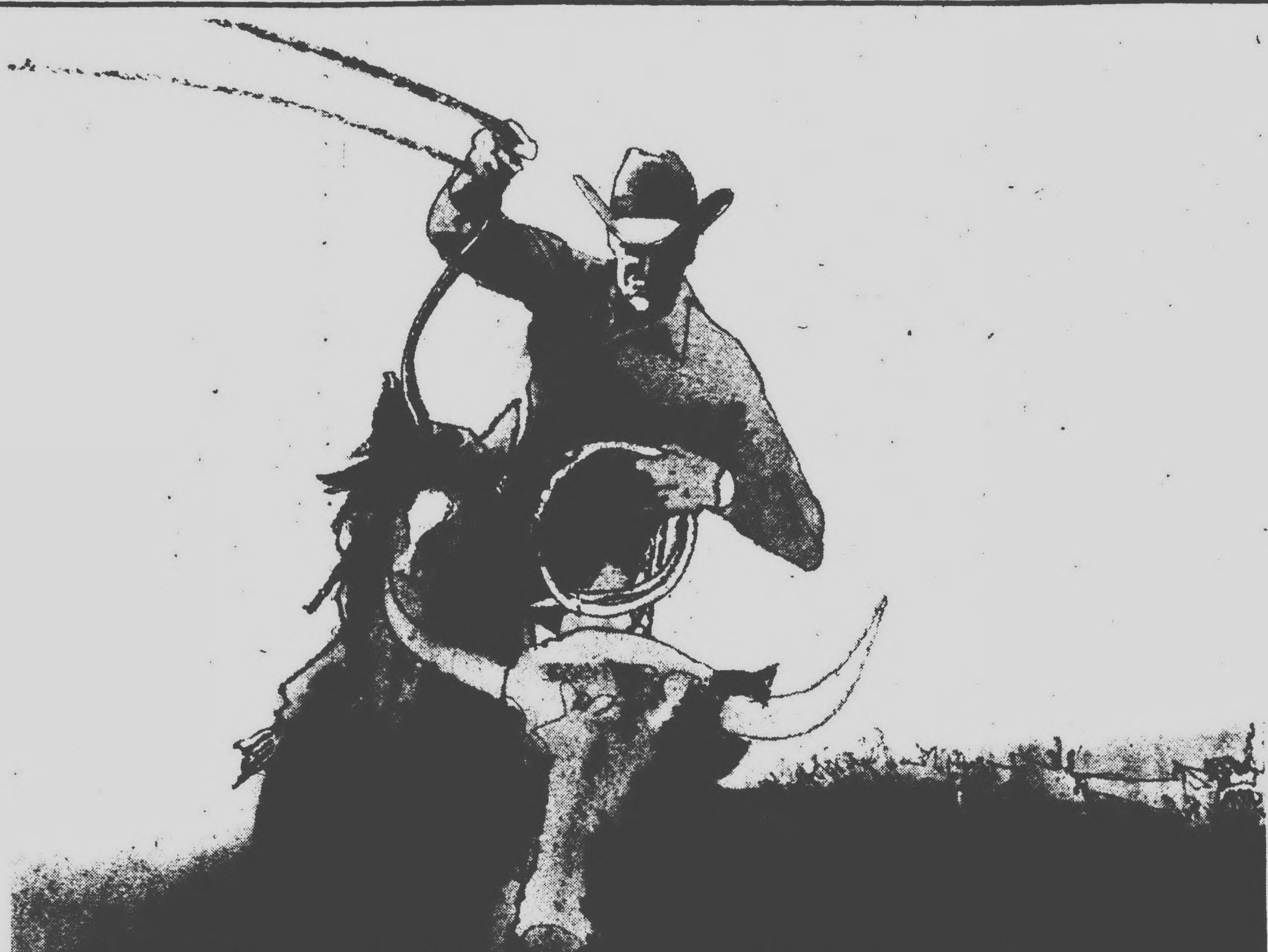
## Julian Bond set to speak at WCCC

# Sky-high sugar changes habits for holiday cooks

By SHERRY KAHAN

The enticing smell of freshly-made cookies, cakes and candy that makes so many homes an aromatic paradise during the holiday season may be considerably diminished this year.

There's evidence of a hardened determination to stop buying sugar until the price stops pushing toward \$3 for a five-pound package.

"Sugar I don't buy — period," said Irene Pearson of Westland, who won't be pulling the usual 150 cookies this year from her oven.

"I may try to bake a little using corn syrup or honey," she added. "We did this during World War II."

For the most part the other women interviewed felt they too, would try to cut out using sugar entirely or at least cut down considerably.

Many even felt a refreshing surge of power after their feeling of helplessness during the rise in the cost of gasoline. There are, after all a number of ways to counteract the rising price of sugar.

"IN OUR HOUSE we use artificial sweeteners," said Barbara Babcock of Redford Township. "We are using very little table sugar. Last year I made about 300 cookies during the holidays. But this year I'll make only 100 using sweeteners."

Most of the those questioned declared they felt they could afford to pay more money for sugar, but they were purposely boycotting it because of their indignation at the cost.

Some were changing their baking habits and seemed to be enjoying the challenge of finding recipes asking for less sugar.

"To have things taste really good you can't substitute or skimp," said Mrs. Fred Gennara of Livonia. "But you can choose your recipe carefully. I have a butter cookie recipe which uses one cup of sugar to four of flour."

Some had become convinced that price was not the only reason to stop buying sugar.

"It doesn't have any nutritional value," said Pat Cousins of Westland.

"Giving it up will help a lot with dentist bills."

DEE CZACH OF GARDEN CITY differed with most of these women, maintaining that she will continue to use sugar "because it is important to have it."

"I used to buy 10 pounds every two weeks," she said. "I do a lot of baking and I make everything from scratch. The kids like to bake cookies and cup cakes for their lunches."

"I won't cut down on the Christmas cookies or the fudge because it means a lot to the kids. I'll just holler when I pay my bill. I hate paying that much but I wouldn't boycott it. Just because things cost more doesn't mean you should boycott them."

Mrs. Czach is compromising, however, to the extent that she now buys half as much sugar every shopping day, supplementing this artificially.

MRS. VIVIAN BRADBURN of Plymouth also hesitates to change her baking habits during the Yule season.

"It wouldn't be Christmas if the kids didn't have cookies to make and cut out and decorate," she said. "We'll do that part at least."

Mary Papalardo, Livonia, also plans to keep baking this year "because if I didn't it wouldn't be Christmas."

"I do bake a lot of fruitcakes for my dearest friends and that is going to be a problem this year," she said.

Mrs. Papalardo has found a recipe for fluffy egg white frosting which uses two egg whites to three cups of corn syrup.

"We've started using honey in our house," she noted. "We still have desserts but they are the kinds that take less sugar, like cheese cake."

Diane Mallow of Plymouth said she is thinking twice about the amount of baking she is going to do. "But when you're planning to entertain, what can you serve?" she said. "More crackers and cheese. I guess."

Kathryn Miller of the same town is lucky. "I have a five-pound bag of sugar left over from when it was 87 cents a pound," she said. "We usually make seven or eight kinds of cookies and candy to give the neighbors but it will be less this year."

Mrs. Joan Engelhardt, another Plymouth resident, is also going to have to cut down on the number of cookies she bakes for her neighbors.

EILEEN REDDINGTON of Livonia has been dropping into bakery thrift shops where she has found decorated cookies that are not too expensive.

"I usually do a lot of baking, but this year I'll keep it low key," she said. "I'm going to use Sugar Twin chocolate chip recipe which uses three-fourths of a cup of Sugar Twin

to a little over a cup of flour."

Another recipe was offered by Molly Krueger of Redford Township who is passing over recipes that call for sugar.

"I buy pound cake and cut it into four layers," she said. "Then I take mix instant pudding, Dream Whip and milk and frost all four layers. It comes out beautifully."

GERRY LIBLANG, also of Redford, used to bake about 200 cookies this time of year, some of which she sent

Mrs. Pearson also hopes a boycott will do the trick. "It's a matter of everyone getting together and doing it," she said. "If no one bought for a while, the price would have to come down."

BONNIE CORNWELL of Garden City said she was following the advice of the Great Scott grocery chain when she began her boycott. "I wouldn't pay the price," she stated.

Nancy Sielski of the same city said

to the office with her husband.

"This year I'm not going to because I think they've gotten out of hand with sugar," she said. "I feel that what I'm doing is a boycott and I feel strongly that it is the thing to do."

Barbara Babcock was one of several agreeing with her. "If enough of us refrain from buying, the price will come down," she said. "This is as good a way as any of protesting."

Mrs. Anthony Rosati of Westland also is boycotting and has "no intention of buying any sugar until the price becomes more reasonable."

a boycott "absolutely will have an effect."

"If no one buys sugar, it will just sit there," she said. "It will back up to the refinery and they will have to lower the price."

She didn't seem to regret not buying sugar. "This is a good way of breaking the sugar habit," she said. "We get enough of it in fruit."

The outcome of this informal boycott vs the steady price rise is uncertain, but a Plymouth woman voiced her own expectations. "I keep expecting sugar to be rationed."

## m.m.memos

The price of sugar is going to make a few inroads in our family's celebration of Christmas, but maybe not as many as changing life styles have done.

Christmas cookies have been part of the scene for all our family years, of course.

In Decembers past, we've made quantities of gingerbread men—I cut and the girls decorated—and batches and batches of shortbread, again heavy with decorations in red and green sugar, and rolled dozens and dozens of rum balls. Then always I've had to come up with a few recipes of refrigerator cookies to fill up the boxes we give away.

BUT ALL THIS has changed a bit over the years as time has shortened at holiday time and interests have widened and we've all counted our calories a little more closely.

"We'll cut back more on the cookie baking this year," I told the girls as we got together briefly at Thanksgiving. "Sugar just costs too much."

"No shortbread?"

Well, yes, we really couldn't do without that Scottish-style cookie that was made by my mother and her mother and the various ladies in and near our family for a lot of years.

We're still trying to turn out some shortbread that the man of our house rates as good as that baked by the best cook of former days. And any-

way, shortbread takes only half a cup of sugar to a cup of butter and two cups of flour.

THE GIRLS FIGURED maybe we could cut back on sugary decorations. But then they insisted it wouldn't be Christmas without rum balls.

Well, maybe a few of them. They rely quite a bit on vanilla wafer crumbs and nuts and corn syrup and of course the alcoholic flavoring.

We hit it finally. We'd stop making gingerbread men.

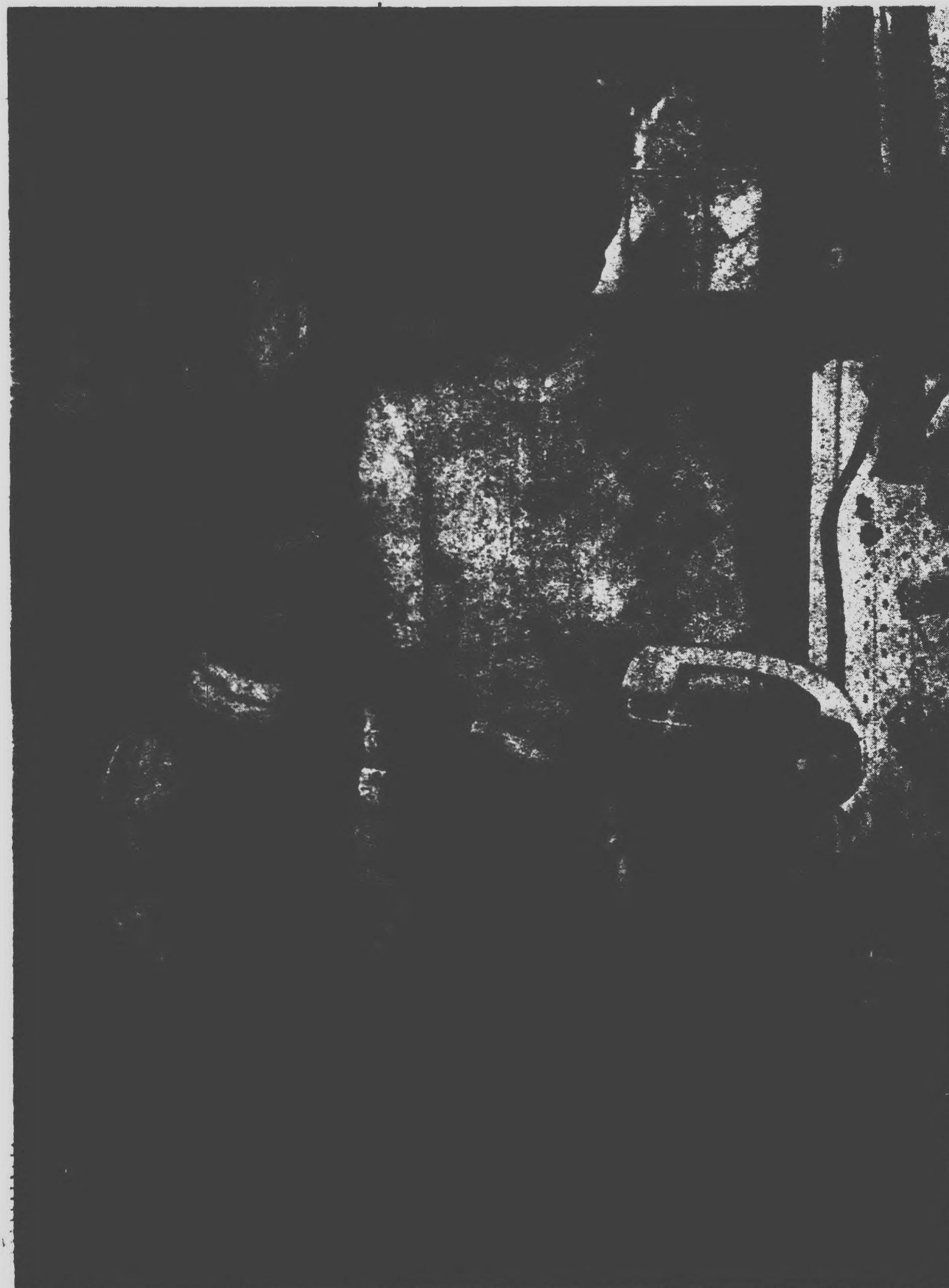
I FIGURE two sisters-in-law who make candy more than cookies at Christmas have a problem much greater than mine.

And for them, as well as Christmas cooks all over the area, I pass on some advice from a university home economist that came to my desk this month.

She says you can cut down the amount of sugar in a cookie recipe and it may not brown as well but still will taste good. But don't tamper with the amount of sweet stuff in candy, she says, or you may have a whole batch fail. And be sure to use special recipes for artificial flavorings.

This holiday, it's indicated in the survey on this page, may be considerably less sugary. The evidence also is strong that it doesn't have to be any less sweet.

## Esch, Ford vote against GI aid veto

Area U.S. Reps. Marvin Esch (R-Ann Arbor) and William Ford (D-Taylor) voted with the majority Dec. 3 to override the President's veto of a 22.7 per cent increase in most GI education benefits.

The congressmen cast their votes with 392 others to solidly block the President's denial of the benefits to seven million Vietnam-era and four million post-Korea veterans. Only 10 congressmen backed the veto.

In the Senate, Michigan's Robert Griffin was the only one to support the veto. Griffin, a long-time Gerald Ford supporter, is assistant Republican leader.

Neither Esch nor Ford were available Wednesday to comment on their votes. Esch represents the 2nd District which includes Livonia and Plymouth and Ford represents the 15th which includes Westland, Garden City and Canton Township.

The increased GI payments are retroactive to September and those veterans now enrolled in school will receive their checks this month. The first regular checks with the increase will go out Jan. 1, according to the Veterans Administration.

The bill extends eligibility from 36 to 45 months and increases monthly payments for fulltime institutional training from \$220 to \$270 for a single veteran; from \$261 to \$321 for a veteran with one dependent and from \$298 to \$336 with two dependents. The rate for each dependent over two is raised from \$18 to \$22.

A new \$600-a-year loan program for veterans is also established for veterans who can't get help from other federal programs.

The Rev. Douglas N. Hodges has taken over leadership of the Norwayne Baptist Church, 3247 Grand Traverse, Westland.

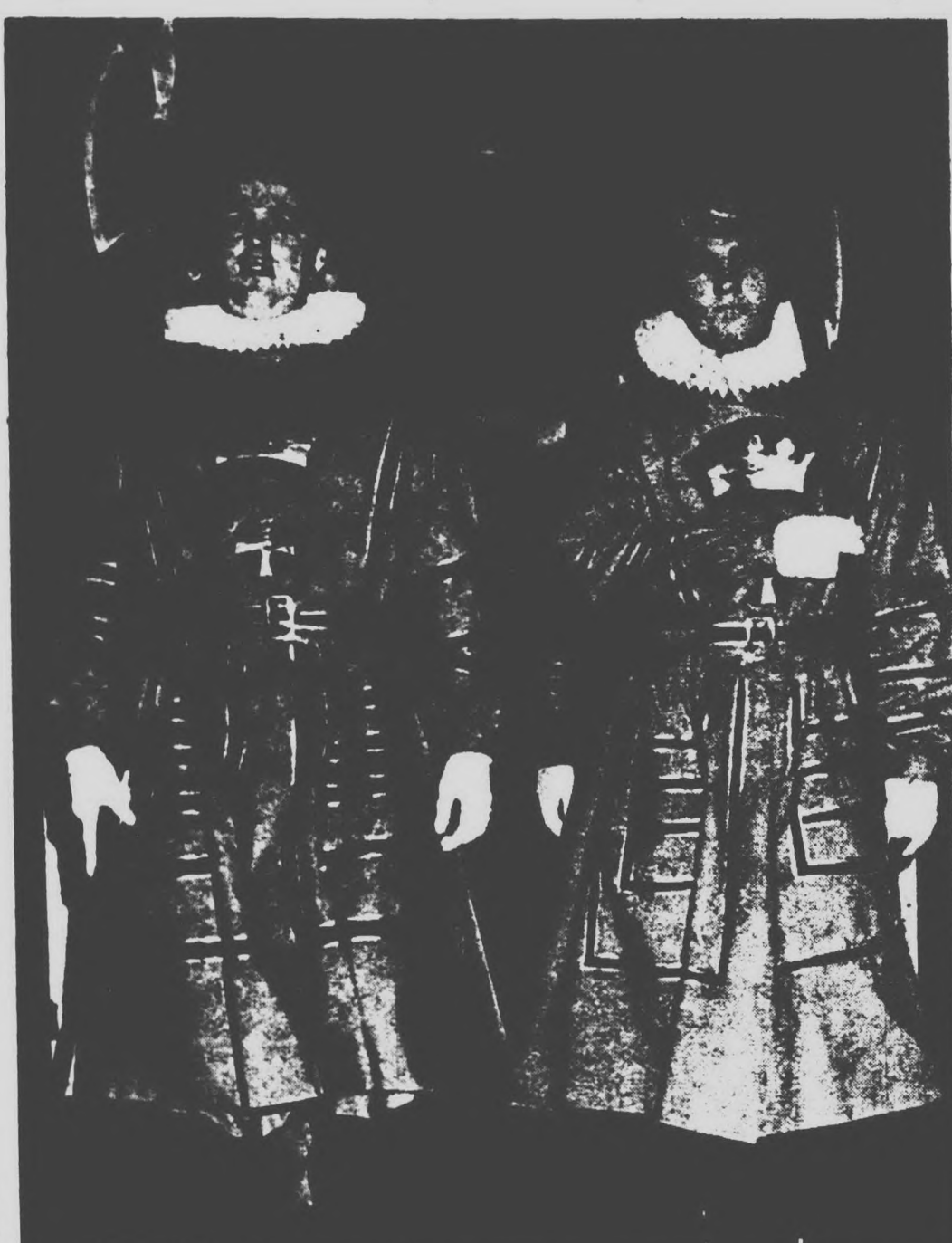

"They would work between 11:15 a.m. and 12:15 p.m.," she continued. "They would take two coolers, one hot and one cold, to the person's home and then remove the plastic containers with the food. The program is very small and probably there would be only two meals to deliver at a time."

Mrs. Beyer pointed out that the boundaries of the area they would

serve are Beech Daly, Seven Mile, Joy and Meyers.

"As a social worker, I see examples of hospitalization of patients that could possibly have been avoided had they received proper nutrition," said Mrs. Beyer. "Meals for the homebound is an unmet need in our community."

## New program on faith

## OLGC offers GIFT

BY MARGARET MILLER

"The whole idea is to grow in faith, and the great thing is that you do it together."

That's how the Rev. Kenneth MacKinnon, pastor of Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church in Plymouth, views the GIFT program his parish has pioneered in the Detroit Archdiocese.

The letters in GIFT spell out Growth In Faith Together, and Fr. MacKinnon feels that since fall OLGC has accomplished a great deal of growth in three stages—research, reflection and response.

NOW IN PROGRESS is the last of these phases, a series of sessions with Catholic leaders in this area on the aspects of faith the parish has deemed most important.

The Most Rev. Walter Schoenherr, auxiliary bishop of Detroit, and the Rev. Anthony Kosnick of Orchard Lake Schools addressed parish meetings this week, and visitors on Dec. 11 and Dec. 12 will be the Rev. Robert Humitz, Archdiocese head of religious education, and the Rev. Patrick Cooney, head of the Archdiocese worship committee.

Each speaker is taking up a different topic from the list of 10 given top priority in the parish program that was in preparation in the first half of this year and put into action beginning in September.

GROWING IN FAITH Together is a program developed in the Baltimore area and adopted by the Plymouth parish.

"We saw it as an attempt to meet some of the questions that have been raised since Vatican II began to change the direction of the church," Fr. MacKinnon said.

"Some of these questions are put

into words—people wonder, for example, about the different terminology their children are learning.

"Some are not voiced—in fact, they may be unrecognized until a program like this focuses thinking on matters of faith. So this project has given people a gracious vehicle for thinking about their faith, talking about it, voicing questions where they turn up and giving support to each other."

THE PASTOR EXPLAINED how GIFT has worked as put into motion in Our Lady of Good Counsel.

As a first step, seven parish leaders spent two days in Baltimore in June, undergoing intensive training with developers of the GIFT program. Parish members were informed of plans being made.

Then, in September, questionnaires went out to all Catholics in the area. They provided for computerized responses so parish members could agree, disagree, strongly agree or strongly disagree with 60 statements involving faith.

These dealt with topics like belief in God and life after death, evaluation of the spiritual value of the Bible, mass, sermons and sacraments, and questions like papal authority, abortion, birth control and marriage for Catholic clergy.

Those who answered indicated their age, sex and occupation and family status, so that the computer tabulation gives a quite complete picture of the beliefs parish members in all walks of life.

"AFTER PEOPLE started thinking about the various aspects of their faith," Fr. MacKinnon said, "we began the reflection phase of the program."

"This involved meetings in homes—about 50 of them—for discussion of the questions raised.

"I made it a point to get to many of these meetings, and it's been beautiful to see one parishioner help another resolve a problem—and to see the people in our parish who have a faith so strong that they can use it to help others."

THE RESPONSE PHASE of the program began with a meeting that drew some 500 members of the parish to vote on top priority questions.

That session involved reports from the reflection groups and then comments from people in the parish at large, then a vote.

Religious education, then adult education, then birth control were given top priority in the matters of concern, Fr. MacKinnon said.

Then came, in order of the number of votes received, church authority, Bible studies, liturgy-mass, homilies, penance, morality and conscience and social activities.

WHAT HAPPENS now that the GIFT program has been completed?

Definitely, says Fr. MacKinnon, programs of Our Lady of Good Counsel will be geared to reflect these top concerns.

But more important, he added, is the fact that "we came to grips with the idea that faith has to be reflected in the things that you do."

He said he expects more emphasis on community service, mission work, help in drug programs and other like matters "because we saw that these would be a way to get into the faith concept and develop the faith of our people."

"When you understand your faith better, and understand that questions about faith are good, then these other things will be easier," he added.

"I think that's how it's going to work out."

## \$15 million may be lost by county

A plea to Congress for renewal of federal revenue sharing has been made by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

The county is receiving about \$15 million in federally-shared funds this year.

"Failure to continue the revenue sharing program could result in a virtual collapse of public services in urban areas throughout the nation," said Robert E. FitzPatrick, board chairman, whose resolution urging renewal was unanimously adopted by the board Nov. 21.

"Adoption of the revenue sharing program in 1972 was one of the most important federal actions of the 1970s. It returned to those closest to the problems — local elected officials — some ability to deal with those problems. It is vital that the program be continued."

"Without these funds, we would be unable to maintain needed public services in fields such as health and medical care, law enforcement and child care because that money represents at least 20 per cent of the county payroll of some \$80 million."

Revenue sharing goes into the county general fund and is allocated along with other funds to support all county services. More than 56 per cent of the budget is devoted to health and related programs.

The five-year revenue sharing program established in 1972 expires in 1977. Some congressmen want to drop the program and return to the earlier federal system of categorical grants which, says FitzPatrick, imposed rigid restrictions on how the money could be used.

## SC budget snowed under

The huge Dec. 1 snowfall took a big chunk out of the Schoolcraft College budget.

Robert Orr, director of plant operation, estimates the cost of clearing the college's enormous parking areas at "several thousand dollars."

The reason the two parking areas are so difficult to clear of snow is their size: one lot is 401,000 square feet, the other 448,000 square feet — or nearly 10 acres each.

The college had to seek outside help from highway construction contractors and a Livonia independent excavating contractor to remove the mountain of snow.

The cost might have gone higher, if the snow were hauled away; instead, road levelers and bulldozers simply pushed it to the far reaches of the parking lots.

The school was completely accessible and ready for classes early Tuesday morning.

## Ski Heil

The Ski Rockies resorts are Aspen, Aspen Highlands, Breckenridge, Crested Butte, Jackson Hole, Park City, Snowbird, Snowmass, Steamboat, Taos, Vail and Winter Park, with their characteristic sunshine, powder snow and sophistication gained considerably in the 1973-1974 season in their bid to become the center of world Alpine Skiing.

The dollar devaluation made skiing in the United States more attractive to Europeans, and the fuel shortage convinced many Americans that one trip to the Rockies was a better idea than several to a nearby ski area.

Business boomed, causing the Rockies to boast of record seasons with five per cent to eight per cent gains over previous record highs. And booming business doesn't mean long lift lines. These resorts have miles upon miles of ski terrain and more than ample lift capacity to serve it.

They call it "crowd dispersal," the art of having the skiers on the mountain not even realize there is such a thing as a crowd anywhere in the vicinity.

Now that the word is out—the resorts are expecting increasing num-

bers of Americans and Europeans to come to the Rockies to sample the slopes, service and snow that have become internationally as superlative. In preparation—the resorts are all working on their trails, grooming them to permit better skiing with less snow, widening them to allow snow grooming vehicles access to control moguls, and many are building new trails and lifts.

The Aspen Skiing Corporation will spend a million dollars on Capital Improvements on Aspen Mountain, Buttermilk and Snowmass. They will cut a new trail for experts on Aspen Mountain, and several on Snowmass for 1975-1976. Breckenridge will have a new restaurant on Peak Nine, as well as trail improvements.

Jackson Hole is installing a new triple chairlift opening one square mile of new terrain for intermediate skiers and connecting Rendezvous and Apres Vous Mountains, to make a five chairlift complex.

Vail has cut two new trails and installed a new chairlift in the Northwest bowl and cut another trail in Game Creek bowl and one at Lionshead. They are also replacing two sur-

face lifts with a chairlift in the beginner-novice area on Golden Peak.

Crested Butte will do trail work and is adding a new convention center.

Snowbird is adding a fourth lodge, the Iron Blossom with 181 luxurious rooms, and is grooming and widening several slopes.

Winter Park will do trail work, and has announced plans to expand by 65 per cent over the next two years by developing the Mary Jane area with 18 new trails, four new lifts and a second base area.

Taos has completed a second double chair lift up the north face of the mountain and has doubled the capacity of the Kachina Basin chair lift. It has added a new run for beginners and novices as well as one for the experts.

Park City is grooming and widening several trails.

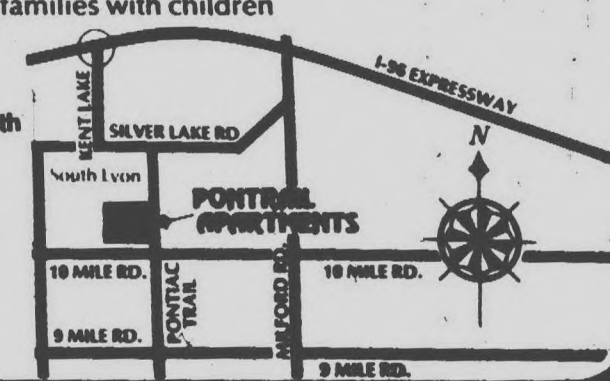

# In The Pocket

Mary Mohacs, Livonia's bowling school teacher, realized one of her life ambitions last week when she took top honors in the world championships in Caracas, Venezuela.

Competing against stars from six nations she won four medals—more than any other contestant—and topped the field in scoring.

To gain the medals she won a gold one as a member of the American team that captured the 5-main events with a six game count of 5821. Of this total Mary contributed 1193 on series of 619 and 574.

After the gold medal she won second in all-events, losing to Olga Gloor, of Chicago, by 13 pins with an average of 193. This entitled her to a silver medal and she added bronze medals (third place) in the doubles and the four-women team event.

## Turf Tips, Quips

It had to come sometime or the capricious Michigan weather wouldn't have lived up to its reputation. Thus it wasn't that much of a surprise when the Sunday blizzard convinced the Hazel Park management it would be better to go dark until weather conditions improved.

Seems like every year about this time of the season the weather acts up and the tracks lose a couple of days and nights. The race tracks can overcome all other problems but they haven't been able to beat the elements.

Since most of the major stadiums are now being built with a roof overhead, we wonder how long it will be before some track in the blustery north decides to cover the racing surface.

It doesn't sound very feasible to enclose an area as large as that covered by the big mile track at the Detroit Race Course...but then strange things have happened in these modern days.

If that ever happened in this section of the land, there wouldn't be any arguments over dates...everyone could operate around the calendar and not worry about the weather.

NOW THAT Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley is involved in a court suit filed by Northville Downs over the 1975 allotment of harness racing dates, one wonders when Gov. Milliken will announce his new appointment...if he plans on making a change.

Milliken can't move in any direction until he has been sworn in to a new term. Then he can announce his appointments. It's a certainty that he won't replace an appointee if that department is involved in any kind of legal matters.

Our information is that the Northville Downs suit will come up before the Appeals Court in Lansing within another week or 10 days. It is a case that must be decided quickly since Northville Downs has the opening dates for 1975 beginning on Jan. 1.

The suit contends the commissioner acted capriciously in not awarding any summer dates to Northville Downs. Executive Director John Carlo points out Northville Downs, which pioneered parimutuel wagering on night harness racing, has traditionally had summer dates since it opened in 1944 and now has been awarded only winter dates beginning Jan. 1.

It will be interesting to see how the court rules when it finally starts to hear arguments from both sides. As indicated above, it must start soon and not carry into the new year or else Michigan's harness racing season will be delayed until a decision is made.

IT TOOK a long time for lighting to strike, but it finally did at Hazel Park when the track management announced it will start working on improving the paddock and Roaring '20s areas as soon as the present meeting ends.

It was rumored in these columns some months ago that improvements were slated for the two areas but the track management moved so slowly that we thought our information was wrong or at least the work would be delayed until sometime next year. The paddock and Roaring '20s will

be glass enclosed, heated and air conditioned. In addition, an enclosed overpass leading from the clubhouse to the grandstand will be constructed and lighting and seating in the grandstand will be improved.

Hazel Park is going to install 1,000 theater-type seats in place of the wooden ones in the Roaring '20s area.

Construction of an overpass from the clubhouse to the grandstand will be a boon for patrons. No longer will they have to walk downstairs, through the paddock to reach the grandstand. They'll be able to walk straight across without going outside.

And for those who like to have a soft drink or hot dog during the afternoon, they'll be able to walk to the grandstand, make their purchases and

return to the clubhouse. There isn't anyplace but in the Roaring '20s area where one can buy a drink and sandwich in the clubhouse.

CAN BILL BROWN'S Erlana's Valley go all the way in the rich pacing series at the Jackson-Northville meeting? That's what folks are wondering after the mare won her fifth in a row last Saturday and became the heavy favorite in the championship finale the last week of the year.

Kimber R. Range and Banner Ranger battled it out in the first division of Saturday's fifth leg of the series with the former hitting the wire in 2:06.2 for the victory.

Then came Erlana's Valley, with Mal Phillips up in the second division,

and the mare just stepped away from her competition to enter the winner's circle after a 2:04.3 mile. That clocking isn't bad for this time of the year and points but that others eligible for the series have a battle ahead.

Northville felt the sting of the worst snowstorm of the century and closed its doors Monday and Tuesday nights.

FROM THE west coast comes word that Don McFarlane's Keystone Smartie came through with another of those upsets that have marked the four-year-old's career.

Guided by Pete Haughton, son of the famed driver-trainer Billy Haughton, Keystone Smartie burst loose in the stretch to win the \$113,350 American Pacing Classic at Hollywood Park in California.

# Recipes and decorative ideas for the holidays

## Let the children help



## Making critters for Christmas

IT'S HOLIDAY TIME. Be whimsical, make cereal candy, then fashion it in critters of all sorts. Use as favors ... or as decorations.

The chocolate-fondant filled bars are for more serious eating.

### Fruitcake Novelty



Fruitcake is traditional during the holidays and traditionally time-consuming to prepare ... until this one. Gayly decorated with glacé cherry flowers and served from within a ring of holly, Ever-So-Easy Fruitcake features a truly novel use for packaged corn flake crumbs, mincemeat and sweetened condensed milk. Measuring and mixing together the seven ingredients result in a batter to be baked slowly, allowing the flavors to blend. For further "ripening," this fruitcake can be well-wrapped and stored a week or more before bringing it to the holiday table.

#### Ever-So-Easy Fruitcake

- 3 eggs
- 2 cups packaged corn flake crumbs
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 14-oz. can (1 1/2 cups) sweetened condensed milk
- 1 28-oz. jar (2 3/4 cups) ready-to-use mincemeat
- 1 lb. (2 cups) mixed candied fruit
- 1 cup chopped nuts

1. Lightly grease 9-inch tube pan; line with waxed paper. Lightly grease waxed paper. Set pan aside.
2. In large mixing bowl, beat eggs until foamy. Add remaining ingredients; mix well. Pour batter evenly into tube pan.
3. Bake in slow oven (300°F.) about 1 hour 45 minutes or until wooden pick inserted near center comes out clean. Remove from oven; cool slightly before removing from pan. Let stand until thoroughly cooled. If desired, decorate with glacé cherries.

Yield: 1 9-inch fruitcake.

Note: Fruitcake may be wrapped tightly in waxed paper and foil and stored in refrigerator for several weeks before serving. For added flavor, wrap fruitcake in liquor-soaked cheesecloth before wrapping in waxed paper and foil.



## For holidays only?

THIS LOW-COST fireplace, with its cheery electric log fire, is built completely without masonry and chimney. The fireplace is easily dismantled so you can store it away after the holidays.

### Create Holiday Centerpiece

Table decorations you create yourself or that the children make, are lovely conversation pieces. The snowman and candle holders shown here are fashioned from Creative Clay and can be made by children. It's a good project that will keep the youngsters happily occupied while mother is busy with other holiday preparations.

#### Creative Clay

- 1 cup corn starch
- 1 package (1 lb.) baking soda
- 1 1/4 cups cold water

In a saucepan, thoroughly stir together corn starch and baking soda. Then mix in cold water. Heat, stirring constantly, until mixture reaches a slightly moist, mashed potato consistency. Turn mixture out on plate and cover with damp cloth. When cool enough to handle, knead like dough. Shape as desired or store in a tightly covered container for future use. To shape Creative Clay, form with hands or roll out to 1/4-inch thickness and cut shapes with a knife or cookie cutter. Trim by moistening shapes or bits of clay and pressing into place. Dry on protected surface at room temperature, allowing up to 36 hours for hardening. Creative Clay may be painted with water colors, poster paints or felt-tip pens. For a glossy finish, brush with clear nail polish or shellac.



Even very young children like to help with cooking, especially when there are party foods or holiday specialties being made.

So why not have a few ideas up your sleeve, with the products on the pantry shelf, ready to keep them busy with things they like to do. Here is a cereal recipe with endless possibilities for the holidays.

IT'S SO SIMPLE it can be made by the eight- and ten-year-old with mother's help to make the basic batch. The youngsters can make their own fantastic "critters" or try modeling animals with a favorite puppy or pussy cat.

The ingredients are wholesome, so if they eat more than they should, no great harm is done.

Or do you have teenagers who can handle more complicated recipes? They should try the No-Cook Fondant and use it to color, flavor, or stuff dates or combine with other chocolate or butterscotch rich candies. Below is a recipe for a candy called chocolate nut bars, rich and chocolaty, with the fondant layer in between layers. Even the littlest one can help wrap these morsels in foil or plastic film.

#### CANDIED CEREAL

- 2 c. crisp rice cereal
- 1/4 c. sugar
- 1/4 c. light or dark corn syrup
- 1/4 t. salt

Heat cereal in shallow pan in 350 degree F. (moderate) oven four to five minutes. Mix sugar, corn syrup and salt in two-quart saucepan. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until sugar is dissolved and mixture reaches full boil. Remove from heat. Stir in cereal. Shape as desired. (If cereal mixture hardens while working with it, place over hot water.)

Faces or animal shapes: Form mixture into round patties (three inches in diameter, 1/2-inch thick) for faces, or desired shapes for animals. Insert skewers into one end of patties, if desired. Decorate with candies such as licorice or gumdrops for eyes, mouth, hair, tails, etc. Use for party favors.

Ice Cream Cups: Mold mixture around lightly greased outside of four (five-ounce) custard cups, making sides about one-inch high. Let cool about three minutes. Remove from cups and fill with ice cream.

Dessert Patties: Form mixture into desired shapes, such as hearts, squares, etc., about 1/2-inch thick. Serve with ice cream.

#### CHOCOLATE NUT BARS

- 1 recipe No-Cook Fondant
- 2-3 c. chopped walnuts
- 2 c. light or dark corn syrup
- 1/4 t. salt
- 1 (14-15 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
- 3 (1-ounce) squares unsweetened chocolate, cut into small pieces
- 1 1/2 c. sifted confectioners sugar
- 1 t. vanilla

Grease 9x9 1/2-inch pan. Spread half of walnuts in bottom of prepared pan. Mix corn syrup and salt in large saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture comes to boil and boils five minutes. Gradually add sweetened condensed milk, stirring constantly, to boiling syrup. Do not let mixture stop boiling. Cook, stirring constantly, until temperature reaches 236 degrees F. on candy thermometer or until a small amount of mixture dropped into very cold water forms a soft ball which flattens on removal from water.

Remove from heat; add chocolate and stir until melted. Gradually stir in confectioners sugar, then vanilla. Cool without stirring about 20 minutes. Stir cooled chocolate mixture and pour about half the mixture over nuts in pan. Roll fondant between sheets of waxed paper to form a nine-inch square to fit inside of prepared pan. Remove top layer of waxed paper. Invert fondant over chocolate layer; peel off waxed paper and press fondant to fit pan. Carefully spread remaining chocolate onto fondant. Sprinkle remaining walnuts over chocolate and press gently into chocolate. Cool at least four hours. Turn onto board; cut into bars or squares with sharp knife. Makes about four pounds.

No-Cook Fondant: Stir one-third cup margarine to soften; add one-third cup light corn syrup, one teaspoon vanilla and 1/2 teaspoon salt, stirring until well blended. Gradually work in one pound sifted confectioners sugar, first with spoon, then kneading with hands. Turn onto board and knead until mixture is smooth and well blended. Cover and store at room temperature. Makes one pound.

## Breakfast Is Essential Even During Holidays

Corn flakes or whole wheat flakes and leftover turkey are the primary ingredients for a holiday breakfast that will make a hit with all family members. Breakfast is just as important during the busy holiday season as it is any other time of the year. But with the many extra activities, some people may neglect this meal.

One way to entice the non-breakfast eaters to the table in the morning is to plan breakfast as carefully as any other meal. Breakfast does not have to be elaborate or take a long time to fix. The wide variety of breakfast cereals available offer convenience as well as nutrition. Keep various kinds of juices and fruits on hand to add interest to breakfast.

For a unique breakfast treat combine corn flakes or whole wheat flakes with leftover turkey to make Turkey Cereal Cakes. This is an excellent combination of foods. Many cereals are fortified with eight essential vitamins and also supply carbohydrates for energy. The turkey provides protein.

Prepare the turkey mixture the night before, cover and store overnight in the refrigerator.

#### TURKEY CEREAL CAKES WITH CRANBERRY ORANGE SAUCE

- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup milk
- 1 chicken bouillon cube
- 2 cups finely chopped cooked turkey
- 2 tablespoons sliced green onion with tops
- 2 1/2 cups corn or whole wheat flakes, crushed to make 1 1/4 cups coarse crumbs
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 tablespoons cooking oil



Melt butter or margarine. Stir in flour, salt and pepper. Add milk and bouillon cube; cook stirring constantly until smooth and thickened. Stir in turkey, onion and 1/2 cup cereal crumbs. Chill until mixture is easy to handle. Shape mixture into 6 cakes, 2 1/2 to 3-inch diameter. Dip each cake into beaten egg, then coat with remaining cereal crumbs. Brown patties in oil over moderate heat, about 10 minutes, turning patties once. Serve with Cranberry Orange Sauce (recipe below).

Yield: 6 cakes.

#### CRANBERRY ORANGE SAUCE

- 3/4 cup water
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 cups fresh cranberries
- 1 cup drained fresh orange sections
- 1 teaspoon grated orange rind

Bring water and sugar to a boil. Add cranberries; bring to a boil. Simmer uncovered until all berries pop, about 5 minutes. Stir in orange sections and orange rind. Cool. Serve with Turkey Cereal Cakes. Yield: About 3 cups sauce.



## Township police patrol studied

A special subcommittee has been formed to recommend a solution to the Wayne County Board of Commissioners by Dec. 31 on whether to continue Sheriff's road patrols in townships.

The subcommittee will consist of Chairman John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights), and commissioners George Killen (D-Detroit) and Mrs. Jarrette Simmons (D-Detroit).

Barr will also invite representation from the Sheriff's department and the deputies union bargaining agent, Local 101.

Although commissioners have appropriated \$350,000 for road patrols in townships, questions remain about how long this service should be offered and how extensive it should be if continued.

The allocation in the 1974-75 county budget is \$117,000 less than the amount allocated last year.

At issue is whether present services should be curtailed to stretch the allocation throughout a full fiscal year or whether the present level of service is to be maintained until the funds are depleted.

Killen and Mrs. Simmons are already members of another subcommittee studying the road patrol service, which has been controversial since 1963.

Barr's subcommittee will also make recommendations on the budget of the Sheriff's marine patrol division, which is authorized to maintain present services throughout the year — contingent on two-thirds reimbursement from the state.

In this area, Redford Township has its own police department but Plymouth and Canton townships rely on the Sheriff's patrol for police protection.

In the November election, Plymouth township residents defeated by a wide margin a millage proposal designed to establish a full time township police department. On the same election day, Canton Township voters defeated a public safety millage proposal to build a new fire station and hire public safety officers whom eventually could be used for some police functions.

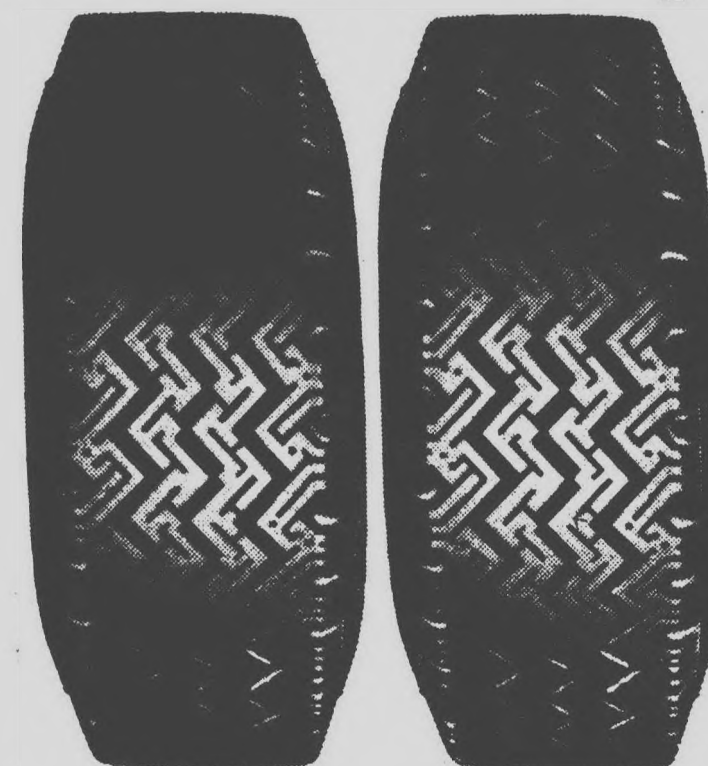

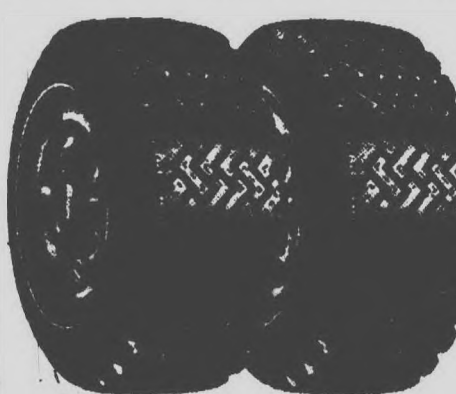

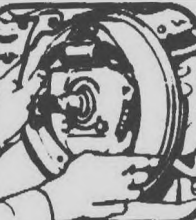

# Teacher enjoys conducting circuit

## SC groups set concerts

William Savola has taught instrumental music in the Livonia School District for more than 15 years. And, although he enjoys introducing youngsters to music and instrument training his first love is conducting.

Savola led his first orchestra as a 15-year-old high school sophomore in Marquette. But, before he stepped to the podium the first time he had to organize an orchestra.

"I wanted to conduct but there was no orchestra in the community. So I started one," says Savola.

He came to Livonia in 1957 and founded the Livonia Youth Symphony. His professional experience includes having conducted the National Philharmonic of the Philippines, Radio Symphony Orchestra of the Finnish Broadcasting Company, Detroit Ballet Company and Michigan Opera Company.

AT ONE TIME he simultaneously conducted three community orchestras in the Detroit area, the Allen Park Symphony, the Scandinavian Symphony and the Women's Symphony of Detroit. He is presently conductor of the Women's Symphony.

Savola says he doesn't approve of the conductor who is constantly flailing his arms and going through "every conceivable contortion on the stage."

"A great part of conducting is thought and empathy with the musicians. It takes a lot of self-discipline. A conductor should not detract from the mood of the music by his stage presence," says Savola.

"After all, the audience comes to hear the music not to see the conductor perform fanatical gestures. The conductor as a leader must strive to represent exactly what is in the musical score without interpolating his own personality above the will or intention of the composer."

Savola considers himself a relatively conservative musician and conductor. He prefers the works of old masters to the more modern composers.

"BEETHOVEN WAS the greatest composer. His music is perfection," says Savola.

He considers Toscanini a great conductor and admires the more recent Zubin Mehta, musical director of the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

Savola, a Plymouth resident, has also played violin with the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra. He has studied with Eugene Ormandy, Wilfred Pelletier and Wieland Wagner.

He received a bachelor of music degree at Northern Michigan University and earned a masters in music at Indiana University.

Besides music, Savola enjoys traveling and sports cars. He has traveled extensively in Asia, Europe, the Middle East and United States. He is of Finnish descent and speaks several languages.

He recently guest-conducted the Amarillo Symphony Orchestra, in Amarillo Texas and one critic described him as "a dynamo of energy on the podium."

December will provide a number of opportunities to hear the orchestra and choirs of Schoolcraft College in performances on-campus and in Plymouth.

Director Richard T. Saunders will lead the Schoolcraft College Orchestra in a special concert Friday, Dec. 6 at 8:30 p.m. in the Waterman Campus Center. Admission is free.

The 45-piece orchestra will be joined by featured guest performers who were students at the college's summer music school earlier this year. On the announced program are Aaron Copland's "Rodeo," and Mussorgsky's "Pictures at an Exhibition."

On Dec. 15 the Schoolcraft choirs will present "A Christmas Celebration" at Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church in Plymouth. Both the Symphonic Choir, which includes community members, and the Schoolcraft Chorus will perform under the direction of Bradley Bloom.

Haydn's "Lord Nelson Mass" and Williams' "Nativity Play Called the First Noel" will be performed by the choir. The chorale will present Bernstein's "French Chorus From the Lark" and Britten's "Ceremony of Carols" with harp.

Admission to the 4 p.m. concert is free. The church is located at 1160 Penniman Avenue.

# Harrison and friends rouse Olympia crowds

Despite George Harrison's rasping voice, the Harrison and friends concert that began Wednesday night and lingered into Thursday morning at Olympia Stadium were instrumentally a great production.

Joining Harrison was the 15-member Ravi Shankar Family and Friends Band without Shankar, who stayed in Chicago because of illness.

The Indian musicians put on an impressive show. However, because the music was so unfamiliar to many of Harrison's Detroit fans, the nearly 16,000 persons who attended the 11:30 p.m. show were getting restless and noisy before the Easterners finished their act. It was unfortunate because the group demonstrated a good blend of classical Indian and contemporary tunes. Their music represented the variety and vitality of Shankar's compositions.

BILLY PRESTON got the audience moving with "Will It Go Round in Circles," the third number in the first set. He got everyone up and dancing and set the mood that paced the rest of the show. Preston's rock and roll renditions and wild stage dancing to "Nothing for Nothing," in the second set got everyone clapping for the rest of the concert.

Harrison's voice was hoarse from the start of the second show and got

progressively worse. By the end of the night he could hardly talk, let alone sing.

Nevertheless, the rail-thin Harrison (the result of a strict vegetarian diet) appeared to be having a good time and gave his audience everything he possibly could.

Harrison's back-up group soloed in the second set and demonstrated its fine musical abilities. The group included Tom Scott on the sax and woodwinds, Robben Ford, guitar; Andy Newmark, drum; Emil Richards, Willie Weeks, Chuck Findley and Preston on the keyboards.

HARRISON finished the show with a few selections from his new "Dark Horse" album. The title song "Dark Horse" was an interesting piece of instrumentation using two acoustic guitars, three flutes and two woodwind sets.

Harrison's final number "What is My Life," received a 10 minute ovation with the crowd clamoring, dancing and demanding more. The group came back and did an encore of "My Sweet Lord," in which Harrison delivered a few Krishna messages. It wasn't the first time either. In the first set he performed "In My Life," and interjected bits of his Krishna beliefs by often changing the lyrics of the song.

Harrison, never forgot the mood of his rock and roll oriented audience and delivered 2½ hours of what the

fans fought the weather and parking lots to see and hear.

SCALPERS were also out in full force. The going price for Harrison tickets, however wasn't as exorbitant as some for recent concerts. Top price was \$30 for two fourth row seats, about \$10 more than normal.

In spite of the late hour (the second show ended about 2:15 Thursday), the fans left looking satisfied. Harrison's first concert was originally scheduled to start at 5:30 p.m. but was delayed almost two hours because the group didn't arrive in Detroit until 6 p.m.

RUNNING TRUE to his social beliefs Harrison, reminded his audience that proceeds from the sale of programs would be donated to the Appalachian Regional Hospitals Inc.

This tour marks Harrison's first appearance since the Concert for Bangladesh in 1971 and his first American tour since 1966, then as a Beatle. When the tour ends Dec. 17 in New York, Harrison and friends will have performed 50 concerts in some 27 cities throughout the United States and Canada.

## Dance program receives grant

"Dance Detroit," the performing company of the University of Detroit-Marygrove College dance program, has received \$7,750 in grants from the Michigan Council for the Arts (MCA) for two dance projects.

A major grant of \$7,250 was awarded to the program for its first full-length ballet production, "Coppelia," to be presented during the Christmas season in the Art Institute.

A mini-grant of \$500 was obtained last summer to help defray expenses for the residency of Paul Sanasardo from New York's Paul Sanasardo Dance Company, who taught classes in the fifth summer school for the performing arts.

## Christmas crafts in Greenfield Village

Authentic Yuletide decorations from many periods in American history are on display now through Jan. 5 at Greenfield Village in Dearborn.

A separate admission is required for the village and museum. Adult admission is \$2.50, and children, six through 14, \$1. Special rate tickets including admission to both are \$4.50 for adults and \$1.80 for children six to 14. Children under six are admitted free.

# Chorale joins symphony in Christmas production

One of the highlights of the Plymouth Symphony's 29th season will be the performance Sunday, Dec. 8 of Berlioz's "L'Enfance du Christ"—"The Childhood of Christ."

The symphony will perform this Christmas oratorio with the Kenneth Jewell Chorale beginning at 4 p.m. in Plymouth Salem High School, Joy west of Canton Center Road.

A Michigan-recruited group, the Kenneth Jewell Chorale is a virtuoso ensemble which has demonstrated a mastery over the full spectrum of choral literature. It has been compared favorably with the Wagner and Shaw chorales.

Admission will be \$3 for adults and \$1.50 for students (kindergarten through 12). The charge for students is being made because of additional costs for this performance.

Conductor Wayne Dunlap calls this work "different kind of Berlioz—classical and cool."

Dunlap recalls the time in 1961 when the orchestra was rehearsing for "The Childhood of Christ." Dunlap remarked to one of the men who audi-

tioned as a singer: "We need a package for choral works that we could put together in one or two rehearsals."

The man took the idea and developed the Grant Williams Chorale, a professional singing group that could produce works like the Berlioz or Handel's "Messiah" with local orchestras around the state.

Williams eventually left the state, and the group was taken over by Kenneth Jewell.

The 19th century master Hector Berlioz wrote it at the peak of his career, in 1854, while he was working as chief music critic for a French journal. He had contemplated the work for most of his career. It is contemporary with two others of his story-telling works, "The Capture of Troy" and "The Trojans at Carthage."

"It's unusual for Berlioz," said Dunlap, "because he usually went in for big effects. 'Childhood of Christ' is performed by a small orchestra. There is a reverent attitude."

"But it's not dull. It has many lovely spots," added Dunlap.

The work is sung in English and has three parts. The first is the bombastic song of King Herod sung by Conwell Carrington (bass); the second, the flight to Egypt; third, the arrival at Sals.

There are four solo parts. The narrator will be Kenneth Ish (tenor), Joseph is Murray Hulce (baritone) and the role of Mary will be sung by Karen Guettler (mezzo-soprano).

Other singers include John Cole (bass) as Polydorus and Gene Wabeck (tenor) as the Centurion.

A friend of Mendelssohn, Berlioz exerted a strong influence on two other composers of the time—Franz Liszt and Robert Schumann. Besides religious works such as a "Requiem Mass," Berlioz was noted for such program works as the "Fantastic Symphony," "Harold in Italy" and "Romeo and Juliet" symphony.

For younger children, babysitting by girl scouts is available. For senior citizens, free bus rides are available from the Tonquish Creek Manor residence in Plymouth beginning 45 minutes before concert time.

## Artists combine talents

Tchaikovsky's fantasy ballet "The Nutcracker" has become traditional holiday fare for music and dance enthusiasts.

"The tempo has to be exactly precise," says Di Blasi. "While the orchestra is rehearsing the music, can be slowed down, but you must always get back to the dancers' tempo."

DI BLASI'S DIVERSE background includes conducting an orchestra for the ballet. He played trumpet for three years for the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo and also served as the group's guest conductor. Di Blasi has

conducted the Oakway since it was formed in June 1973. He led the group's first concert in October 1973.

The orchestra and ballet also will perform the "Nutcracker" Friday, Dec. 20 in the Music Hall for the Performing Arts in Detroit.

The Michigan Ballet Theater, designated as a performing company by the Mid-State Regional Ballet Association is now in its sixth year. The company, headquartered in Farmington Hills, has a repertoire of some 15 ballets and has staged performances each year since it was formed.

The dancers range in age from 12 to 21. The "Nutcracker" performance will also feature extras, recruited from North Farmington High School, and many company apprentices.

"OUR VERSION of 'Nutcracker' is a little different from most. We've used our license to change and add to the ballet to feature Clara as a teenager, instead of the traditional young child," says Evelyn Kreason, artistic director of the Michigan ballet.

"Our company has been performing 'Nutcracker' for six years. Although it's a children's show, it has a univer-

sal appeal. From the snow scene to each of the character flavors, it has a little bit of every character you can imagine.

"Nutcracker" is the fairy-tale story of Clara and the handsome prince, who takes her on a strange but interesting and colorful journey. The ballet offers the fantasy numbers "Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy," "Waltz of the Flowers," "Dance of the Flutes" and the Russian "Trepak."

THE LONG HOURS of rehearsal have passed and so have the problems of scheduling those sessions. The stage is set and dress rehearsal has been completed. Musicians and dancers are anticipating an eager and enthusiastic audience.

Performances are slated for 8 p.m. on Saturday and 4 p.m. on Sunday. Tickets for Saturday's show are \$3.50 for adults and \$2 for students and senior citizens. Tickets for Sunday's performance are \$3 for adults and \$1.50 for others. Tickets for both shows can be purchased at Hudson's and Grinnell's stores. They will also be available at the door.

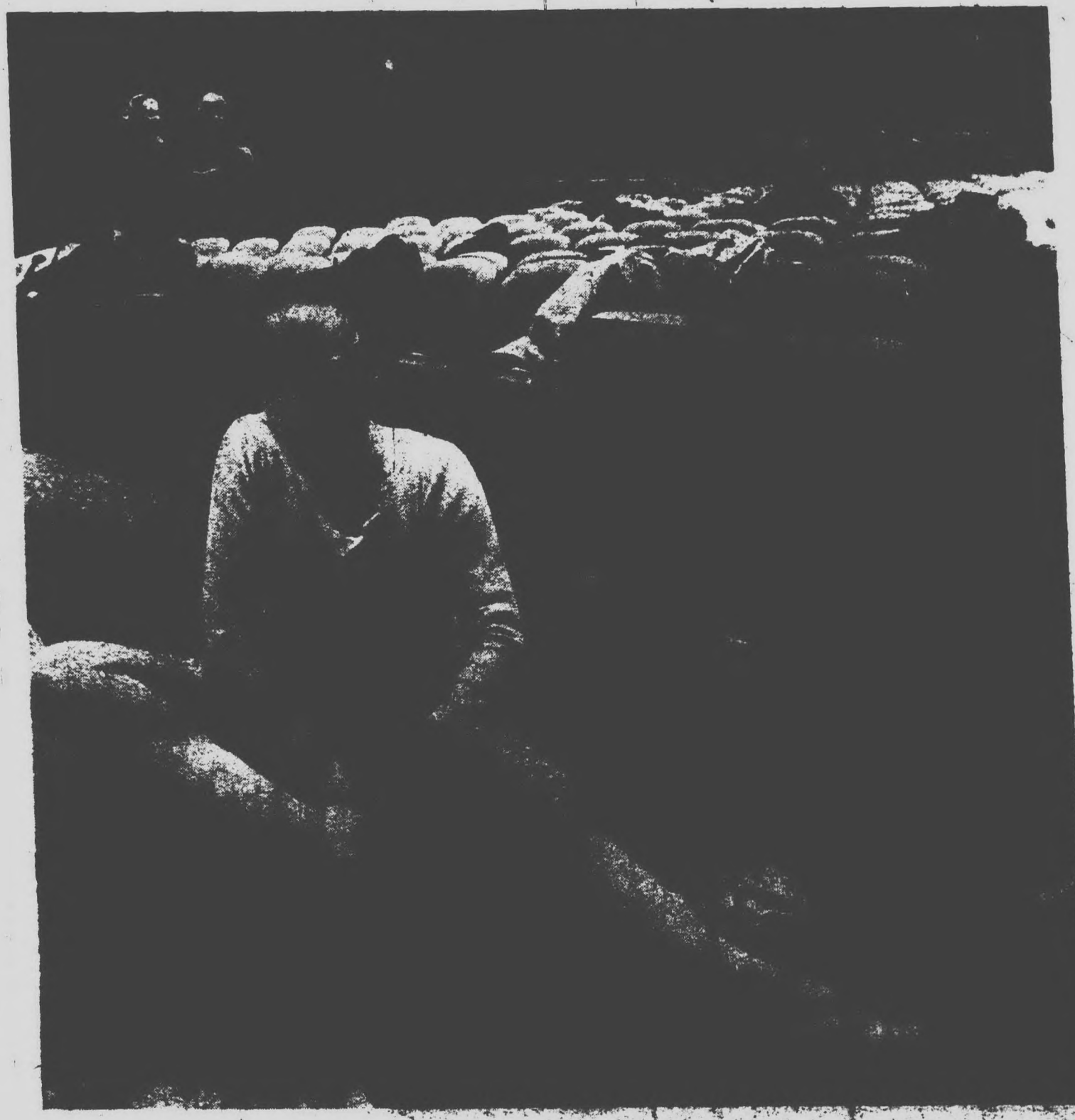

## BUSINESS

How corporations  
change their 'face'

"What's in a name?" someone once asked.

Apparently that is still a very timely question. It is one that is being asked more and more frequently by business and industry, who are turning to experts for the answer.

The experts in the question of business identity, it turns out, are advertising agencies. They are the new "name" or "image" makers.

These days, when a company has problems, whether it is flagging sales or a poor reputation, it can go to an advertising agency to either increase the sales of the ailing business or to launder their public image with a "new identity" program.

HISTORICALLY, the identity of a company involves a very important ingredient: a company symbol, sign or mark. This mark is referred to as a "logotype," or more commonly, a "logo." It is toward this little emblem, or trademark, that the agencies direct most of their attention.

In common usage, the word logo, or logotype, refers to the trademark, or name, of a company. It is usually a word or two or more letters. It can even be a picture.

In older days, a business was designated by colorful signs or marks. A shoemaker, for instance, would use a sign of a golden boot to indicate his trade. A grocer might use a picture of loaves of bread.

The two principal functions of a logo or trademark is that of both a mark of identification and a seal or signature of authenticity.

WHEN A COMPANY has poor sales performance and lacks a good image, it is usually because of several specific reasons, according to Tom Pelant, president of Artra associates, a Southfield-based design firm.

"It is either because the logo is poorly designed, or the design is used inconsistently," he said. "Many times there is not a sufficient connection between the product and the idea expressed by the company's logo."

Lately many logos have lost the function of symbolizing the product that is being sold.

"A logo should be informative about the kind of business a corporation is engaged in," said Pelant.

HE SAID that usually the biggest problem with any company's image is that they do not present a consistent "face" to the public. "Their signs, stationary and product images are usually disjointed and unfocused," he emphasized.

"If a real estate company, for example, does not have a consistent image from sign to sign," he explained, "it can and does affect their business."

"You have to have a systematized, modular approach to logos," Pelant said.

As examples of unified modular corporate images, he cited franchise operations such as Howard Johnson's, MacDonald's, Big Boy. "They always look the same, no matter what city they are in," he said.

Local signage codes have let retailers in this area put up a "hodgepodge" of signs that are "visually illegible" to the consumer, he said. "Most local signs do not mean anything and they are not working well."

"Some of the worst examples are even impossible to read, not because there are so many of them but simply because they are so poorly designed."

PELANT CITES the automotive companies having the initiative and foresight to spend a great deal of effort and money to coordinate their images and to make their signs effective and readable.

There is, he explained, a positive and consistent presentation of the Ford logo, for example, on every Ford product and design.

"Ford has a strict, modular form of design which has been redesigned and updated several times to make it more contemporary," Pelant said, "but it still has not lost its original and design aspects."

Seeing the designs used consistently and correctly is a big issue with most advertising and design firms. Kevin Tolman, a graphic designer for Artra, summed up the feeling on this subject.

"It's an ego thing, I suppose, but it sort of hurts your feelings to see a really good image that you designed not being used properly, so the whole look and impact is destroyed."

JIM RAMSEY an account supervisor for McCann Erickson advertising agency was recently involved in "jazzing up" the image of one of his agency's biggest accounts, Buick.

The fundamental problem, they discovered, was that the name "Buick" had a bad reputation. "It didn't stand for enough of the right things," Ramsey said. The Buick line has traditionally had an unfortunate reputation for being big, expensive "gas hogs."

"Put all these negatives together," stated Ramsey, "and you have quite a problem."

THIS YEAR, the Buick line added two new cars which were unlike the old image: the Skyhawk and the Skylark. They are small, sporty, and economical. Or fairly economical, anyway. They have in other words, contemporary appeal.

McCann Erickson decided to take the symbol of the Skyhawk and use it as a logo to "light up" the whole Buick line.

Using a hawk to symbolize an attitude of freedom and independence, the agency has attempted to appeal to the sense of individuality and independence they believe lurks in every person's heart.

As a result, the idea of freedom and independence has been linked with the product through the association between a hawk, the idea of a free spirit and the name "Buick."

At the end of every Buick commercial now, instead of hearing the old "wouldn't you really rather have a Buick" line, the viewer sees a beautiful and graceful hawk alighting upon the mundane name of Buick to the inspiring message, "dedicated to the free spirit in just about everyone." The association becomes nearly irresistible.

"We hope the thought of 'free spirit' becomes connected with the idea of a whole variety of Buick products," Ramsey said.

### New car operation costs much higher over last year

Higher new car prices coupled with increased gasoline prices are costing the Michigan motorist 20 per cent more to own and operate an automobile than it did a year ago, according to the Automobile Club of Michigan.

The Auto Club computes the cost of driving a full-sized, American made

car at 19.8 cents a mile compared to 16.3 cents in 1973.

THE 19.8 cents figure is computed on 5.7 cents a mile for variable costs such as gas, oil and maintenance and 14.1 cents a mile for fixed costs such as insurance, depreciation and license fee.

The Auto Club compiled its figures by driving a 1974 eight cylinder, four-door hardtop Chevrolet with standard equipment including automatic transmission, power steering, power disc brakes and radio. Joseph Ratke, Auto Club touring manager, points out that while some 1975 cars may offer improved fuel economy resulting in slightly reduced operating costs, the cost reduction will be more than offset by the higher prices of new models.

Operating costs will also be governed by the area in which you drive with rural areas offering lower operating costs than urban areas.

Based on annual mileage of 10,000, it costs approximately 12.1 cents per mile to operate a compact, six-cylinder model in a low cost area and 17.9 cents a mile to drive the same car in a high-cost location.

MOTORISTS should also expect to add 20 cents a day in operating costs for air conditioning.

Motorists interested in improved fuel economy should consider weight as the greatest weight penalty, ranging from one to two percent miles per gallon for every 100 pounds.

Motorists wishing to improve mileage should consider buying radial tires which can improve fuel economy from three to 10 per cent with steel-belted radials generally producing the better mileage.

preparedness is the Michigan Weather Service. Fred Nurnberger, meteorologist for the service, says: "Unlike the National Weather Service, we don't forecast the day to day weather."

"We compile data from more than 200 cooperative weather stations located throughout the state and can tell what has happened in the past and what can be expected in the future."

NURNBERGER said the collection of snowfall data is a challenge to even the heartiest observers and a task made more difficult by the high winds and drifting which frequently accompany snow in Michigan.

"In spite of adversities, the data taken by volunteer observers exhibit close agreement over a period of 50-75 years."

### How important are snow stats?

For some Michigan residents, home is where they hang their snowshoes. But residents in southeastern Michigan must plan ahead for weekends of skiing, sledding and snowmobiling.

Planning for winter activities in Michigan involves more than choosing the right winter vacation time, says B. Dale Ball, director of the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

FOR BUSINESSES catering to winter sportsmen, it is important to know when the right kind and right amount of snow can be expected.

Snow removal programs must be prepared for action when that first substantial snowfall occurs. Some outdoor construction work, such as home-building, must be scheduled for completion before bad weather sets in. The MDA's contribution to winter

# Land-use controls suffer setbacks

Environmental land-use controls are suffering setbacks from the voters, from the courts, and from builders and developers. University of Michigan Prof. Karl G. Pearson said this week at a meeting of the Illinois Association of Realtors.

Pearson, U-M professor of business administration and director of real estate education, added that "some appraisers are also viewing land-use controls with skepticism."

The U-M authority noted that in recent elections, California voted by a 3-2 margin against a proposal by environmentalists to halt construction of the New Melones dam by the Army Corps of Engineers; Utah voters by popular referendum rescinded the enactment of land-use planning pro-

posals; Rhode Island voters rejected a bond issue for solid-waste disposal and drinking water treatment facilities.

IN OTHER ACTIONS, he added, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) some months ago was forced to withdraw its proposed taxes on employer-provided parking and on commercial and shopping center parking.

Likewise withdrawn were its proposals for mandating car pooling, and for giving cars with multiple occupants priority lanes on streets and freeways; an Indianapolis area plan to reduce vehicular traffic with parking surcharges has been stalled; opposition currently is mounting against the "coercive" features of land-use controls in flood areas.

## Home & Garden

A recent successful suit against EPA asked the court to authorize the use of DDT insecticide to halt the Tussock moth infestation alleged to be threatening 600,000 forest areas in the Northwest. Prof. Pearson continued.

Supporters for construction of Auburn Dam in California overcame in court the opposition of three environmentalist organizations; a judge ruled against Petaluma's (Calif.) anti-growth restrictions on new dwelling units and new residents while a St. Pe-

tersburg (Fla.) ordinance to limit population was overturned.

"THE EFFECT of the energy crisis has also served to curb some environmental restraints," Pearson said.

"The North Slope petroleum project in Alaska is moving apace. The dire need for petroleum here was sufficient to overcome environmentalist opposition. Petroleum needs are also making for approval of off-shore oil well drilling projects, with stipulated controls against oil spills.

"The need for coal will give the go-ahead to surface mining in the west, also with proper provisions for land reclamation.

"Some real estate appraisers are concerned, lest new environmental enactments will create an instability in real estate evaluations. If a factory is ordered to stop operations because of alleged pollution, then the factory and the site may become worthless as real estate. If a shopping center has to limit its space for parking, this will cause a decline in sales and profits, and it will be worth less as income property.

"IF A LOW-INCOME housing project cannot be built in a central city area, due to inability to meet noise standards and still comply with cost limitations, then the area may have to be abandoned, with further decline in real estate values.

"In fact, San Diego lenders now re-

quire appraisers to assess the effect of environmental controls on value as a mortgage loan determinant. They are in effect echoing a common cry among builders and developers: 'EPA rules are contributing greatly to our increased costs.'

"Some turnabout from federal controls is discernible, however, in the community block grants in new housing legislation, in which the locality will have the say, rather than the federal government, on the mode of grant disbursement," Pearson concluded.

"Instead of the federal government subsidizing the construction of housing per se, the new trend seems to be to subsidize incomes so that families can afford housing. Perhaps this shift comes about because under the old federal housing subsidy programs, the Department of Housing and Urban Development was saddled with some 200,000 defaulted units."

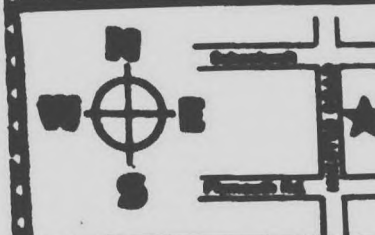

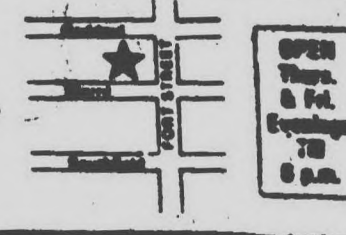

### Corn husk dolls:

*As appealing now  
as a century ago*

In the days when all treasures under the Christmas tree were made by hand, corn husk dolls were a favorite gift.

Today, starting from scratch or using a convenient kit, you can make the dolls that delighted children a century and more ago.

Note: Corn husks must be wet for easy working. Soak them in a solution of hot water and two to three teaspoons glycerine until they are pliable.

1. Begin your doll by making the arms. Roll up a husk tightly; tie with string at each end to form hands and again in the middle. Then add a blouse sleeve by attaching two corn husks slightly above the tie for the hands; pull these pieces back toward the center, slightly overlapping so the sleeve will be closed; secure with

string. Form the head out of scraps of husks. Wrap with husk and tie at the neck with string, leaving ends that are long enough to serve as bodice pieces.

2. To put head and arms together, place the arms between the bodice pieces. Wrap a husk over each shoulder of the doll, crossing in front and back at the waist. Secure with string at the waist.

3. Two or three large husks are used for the skirt, depending on the fullness desired. Attach each husk at the doll's waist in an upward position, then fasten string tightly around the waist to hold in place. Pull husks down to form skirt. Trim bottom of husks so the doll stands straight.

4. Finishing touches are left to your ingenuity. Hair may be added using corn silk or hemp. You also may wish to add a husk hat, or a gingham apron and bonnet.
