## Townships amend police funding suit

CANTON—The township's fight with Wayne County over police protection may have taken a turn in favor of the township due to a decision made recently at a meeting of township supervisors and lawyer Louis Wechsler.

Under state law, the county must provide police services to the townships, but no specific level of service or funding is stipulated. As a result, the degree of protection afforded the townships by Wayne County is in question.

Recognizing this, the seven townships affected by the county's decision to reduce the funding of the road patrol asked attorney Wechsler to file an amended complaint in circuit court.

AS WECHSLER explains it, the old complaint asked for a restraining order to prevent a funding cutback, but that complaint "could have been interpreted to mean the current level of service received by the townships was adequate."

The amended complaint will state that the current level of police service the townships receive "is inadequate, and that a reasonable level of protection should be established and adhered to."

Wechsler explains that this effort will avoid setting funding guidelines, and will instead place the emphasis on service, "where it should be."

As evidence, Wechsler will introduce federal standard of police protection that will show the townships are inadequately protected.

Robert Greenstein, Canton Township supervisor, claims that if the federal standards were imposed, the county would have to increase protection "10-fold." Wechsler will also introduce county guidelines as evidence, as he claims they are not being followed.

CURRENTLY the Wayne County Sheriff's Road Patrol operates from two to four cars on any one shift. But these cars must cover a region of 200 square miles, including Brownstown, Canton, Plymouth, Northville, Sumpter, Van Buren and Huron townships. According to undersheriff Loren Pittman, the patrol tries to maintain at least three cars on the road at any one time, but the shortage of manpower often prevents that.

Greenstein indicates that the

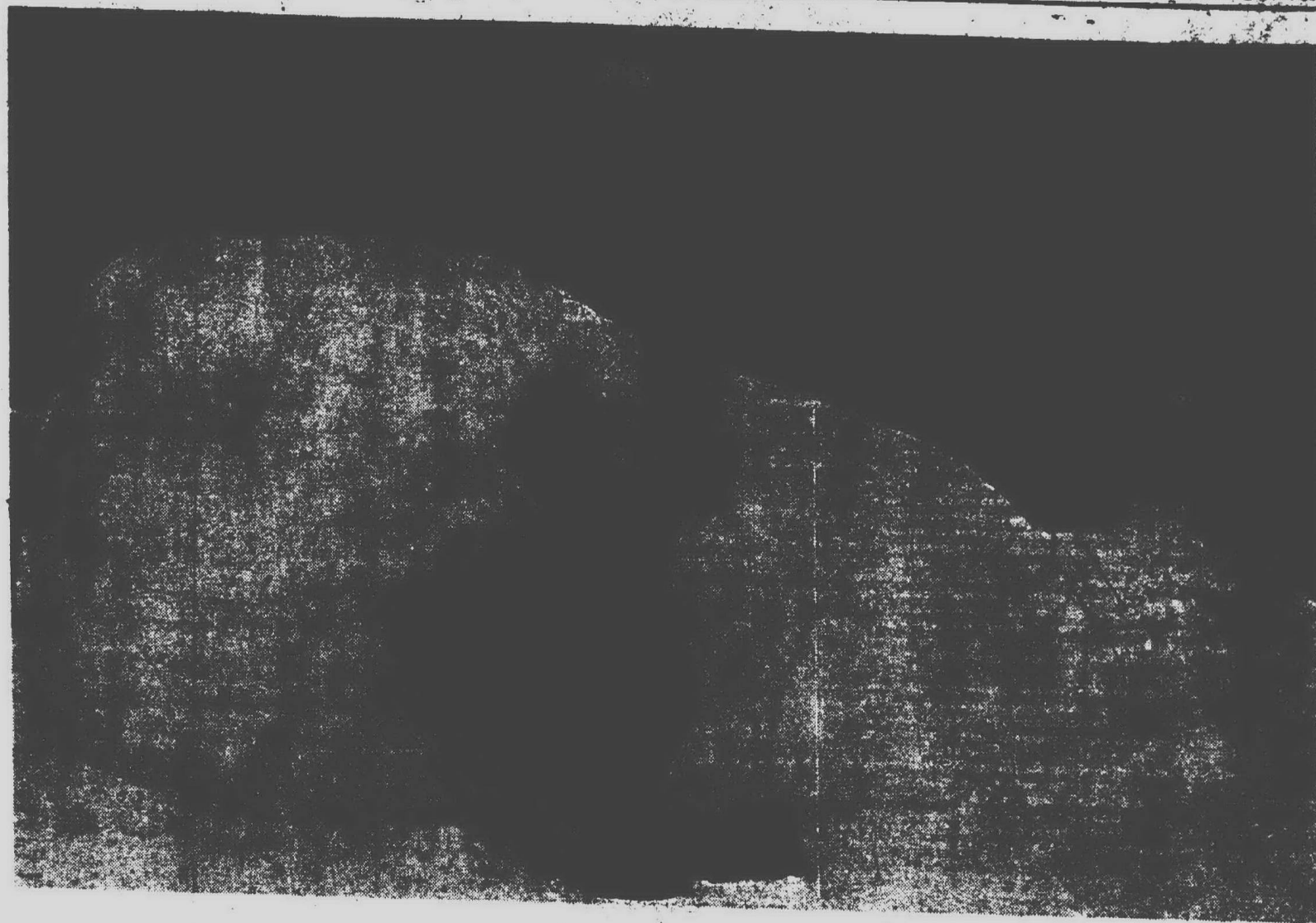
amended complaint will bring more pressure to bear on the county.

"Before they had nothing to lose, because we were asking for a maintenance of the current service, but now we're asking for more service and this will mean they stand to lose something."

Greenstein hopes that this added pressure will force the county to take the townships seriously enough to negotiate an out of court settlement.

The amended complaint will be filed in January, according to Wechsler, and there will be a meeting between the seven township supervisors and the Wayne County Board of Commissioners judiciary committee after the new complaint is filed.

Says Wechsler, "Perhaps now they'll change their tune."

## Kaiser retires from planning commission

### He's leaving after 15 years

CANTON—Residents of the township will soon be bidding farewell to a man who has devoted a good deal of the last 14 years of his life to public service in Canton.

That man is Wes Kaiser, and in the last decade and a half he has served both as a trustee on the Plymouth Community school board and as a member of the Canton Planning Commission, a body he chaired in part of 1973 and 1974.

Kaiser is a charter member of the planning commission, as he was on the zoning board in 1960 when it was changed to its present status as a planning commission. When he retires Dec. 31, only Bart Berg will remain as an original member.

Kaiser gives many reasons for his retirement from public life but his primary reason is simply that "new blood" is necessary.

"I told Bob (Supervisor Robert Greenstein) that I've been on the commission a long time, and I'm sort of worn out. You know, after a while you need new blood and new ideas on any governmental body."

Greenstein is only one of many people Kaiser has worked with in the last 15 years who is sad to see him retire.

The supervisor spoke highly of Kaiser and said, "he's been on the planning commission for 14 years, and he is a knowledgeable and dedicated gentleman who has worked long and hard for this township. Quite frankly, I'm sorry to see him go."

Kaiser moved to Canton in 1948, and now at the age of 57 he is looking forward to retirement. He has worked with Detroit Edison for 39 years as a high wire inspector and most of his spare time has been devoted either to township service or activities in the United Methodist Church.

In 1968 Kaiser ran for school board trustee and won. He served on that body for four years and during that time he was appointed to the planning commission by Lou Stein. He served as a liaison between commission and the school board, before devoting his energies full time to the planning commission.

But members of the school board who worked with him recall him fondly. Mel Blunk, who spent 18 years with the school board as assistant superintendent of business, spoke of Kaiser, "He had the full respect of all board members. He was the kind of guy who didn't talk a great deal, but when he did, everyone listened. He was a real stabilizing influence on the board and you always knew where he stood. He was open and honest, sincere and businesslike."

Esther Hulsing, who served as secretary to the school board during Kaiser's tenure, also praised him. "He had a lot to contribute and he was level headed, in fact you might say he was unflappable, and I guess those are two excellent attributes for any public official. He was an excellent school board member and even those that argued with him remained his friend. I'm sorry to see he's quitting the planning commission, he knows

an awful lot about building and that sort of thing."

Kaiser served as chairman of the planning commission after George Lawton's resignation in March of 1973 until Joseph Kinnick was elected chairman at the start of this year. He also served on the Plymouth Human Relations Commission for several years after retiring from the school board.

Kaiser says he will continue to remain interested in the activities of Canton Township, but now as a private citizen. He is looking forward to more time at home with his wife Anne, and some travelling.

"I'm also going to get in some more fishing and hunting. Especially the fishing now that I'll have some extra time on my hands," explains Kaiser.

But for those who have worked with Kaiser he will leave behind a legacy of openness and concern, in a time when Canton Township was going through the most rapid growth pains that any community could experience. Says Bart Berg who has served side by side with him on the commission for 14 years, "His concern about people was tremendous, and I consider it a privilege to have worked with him and known him."

## Ann Arbor Road reopens to traffic

PLYMOUTH—Delayed slightly by an 18-inch blanket of snow, Ann Arbor Road is now open, making cross-town driving just a bit easier for motorists.

Closed since early in October, a stretch of the road from Main Street to Lilley Road is now complete with a new bridge over the Tonquish Creek. The road was officially opened Wednesday morning.

The remaining construction will begin again in May and motorists will probably be happy to know that the rest of the project will not require that the road be closed.

The reason for the two-month closing of the quarter-mile section of the road was for the installation of a new bridge over the Tonquish Creek.

Work on the widening of the 3.788 miles of roadway from Sheldon to I-275 is being performed by the Thompson and McCulley construction com-

pany. The state project was begun on Aug. 7 and will cost \$2.8 million.

When completed, the road will have five lanes of pavement, plus some new sidewalks which are being funded by the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

No further details were available on the next stages of construction, but under terms of the contract, the construction company still has more than 140 working days to complete the project once work is resumed next spring.

Thompson and McCulley, Project Manager Tollie Berryman said that if there were no serious delays in the second phase of construction the roadway could be completed by "sometime in August" of next year.

The widening of the roadway includes pouring a completely new 60-foot concrete roadway, followed by curbs and gutters.

## CEP band will march to raise Bowl trip funds

It'll be a kind of "come on out and meet the band" event in the Plymouth area Wednesday afternoon, Dec. 11.

That's the time when about 40 members of the Plymouth Centennial Park marching band will board the bus for musical stops in the community. Those already arranged include 15 to 20 minute concerts at the Plymouth Center for Human Development, West Trail Nursing Home, Howmet Corp. and Vico Products.

The man behind all this is Dennis Golbesky, controller of Howmet and member of the Chamber of Commerce. Golbesky heard about the band going to play in the Orange Bowl parade and decided a little financial support for the trip from the business and industrial community was in order.

So, after clearing with school officials, he sent out more than 200 letters to the business community asking the businesses to sponsor a band visit.

Funds from this will be used to help offset the cost of the trip to each of the 40 band members.

Through the sale of decals and through the assistance of the businesses, the band will be able to raise the money needed for the trip. The band will be in the area for about a week and a half, and will be playing at a number of locations. The band is a private

ing home are being sponsored by several local businesses who wanted to contribute to the cause, but either didn't have room or enough audience for a mini-concert.

Many of the donations which have come without a commitment from the band Golbesky calls "very surprising." He plans to compile a list of all who have participated in the trip sponsorship.

The band, which also participated in the Rose Bowl Parade two years ago, leaves for Florida Dec. 28. Band members will give two performances at Disney World before going on to Miami for the New Year's Eve Orange Bowl parade. They all have tickets for the New Year's Day game between Notre Dame and the University of Alabama and will fly home shortly after.

Parents were required to make the commitment for the trip last April. All funds raised will be amortized over each student's cost.

Golbesky, who has no connection with the marching band other than a deep personal pride, says of the invitation, "It's a fantastic thing for the community. Not most of us in the business community who don't live in the area, but it's a chance to show the band some recognition and support. It's a private

bus to take the band on its local afternoon tour. He plans to return the musicians to the schools around 3:30 p.m., unless, of course, more people call at the last minute for a little afternoon musicale. In that event the schedule will become very flexible and band members will be delivered home by charter bus when it's over.

# Super sewer plan debated

Wayne and Washtenaw County officials will seek a compromise between a complete interceptor or super sewer system and a series of treatment plants to handle the waste disposal of their counties and Oakland County for the next 20 years.

According to George Bingham, Wayne County Director of Public Works, the two counties have before them 12 alternate compromises and hope to narrow the plans to four before presenting them to local communities at the end of the month. A public hearing on the final decision is set for January.

"We have begun to study a compromise of the extremes," Bingham said. "We have a lot of work to do and little time to do it."

THE INTERCEPTOR alternate provides for the entire area to be served by a complete system transporting wastewater to a single regional treatment plant near the mouth of the Huron River with the treated waste to be discharged into Lake Erie.

The local plant alternate calls for a series of plants and interceptors with some existing plants to be expanded and upgraded with new plants to be built. The treated waste from the plants would be discharged to the Huron, Rouge and Detroit rivers.

A third alternate mandated by the Environmental Protection Agency has been given the kiss of death by Bingham.

It is a land disposal alternate in which the Corps of Engineers has identified central Monroe County as having soil suitable for disposal purposes.

"Land disposal is a lot like railroad stations and incinerators," Bingham said. "Everyone wants them built somewhere else."

"Land disposal is a do nothing approach. We have to consider it but we're not going to spend a lot of time considering it."

"When the law was written the Corps saw land disposal as a great panacea but since then we've had some second thoughts."

BINGHAM emphasized that the counties have to come up with only one plan instead of two and added he expected opposition from some communities.

"Before settling on one plan we'll go to the municipalities first. We don't expect 100 per cent unanimous agreement from everyone but hope to satisfy the needs of most. What we have to come up with is a plan acceptable to Wayne and Washtenaw counties."

In the past Wayne County has favored the single interceptor plan claiming the Huron River could not handle wastes of a number of local treatment plants. Washtenaw has favored each community treating its own waste.

Bingham indicated that whatever the plan, financial arrangements would be worked out during the construction planning phase of the operation.

THE FEDERAL government will supply 75 per cent funding, with the local governments picking up 20 per cent and the state the remaining five per cent.

## Hearings begin Wednesday on aerosol sprays

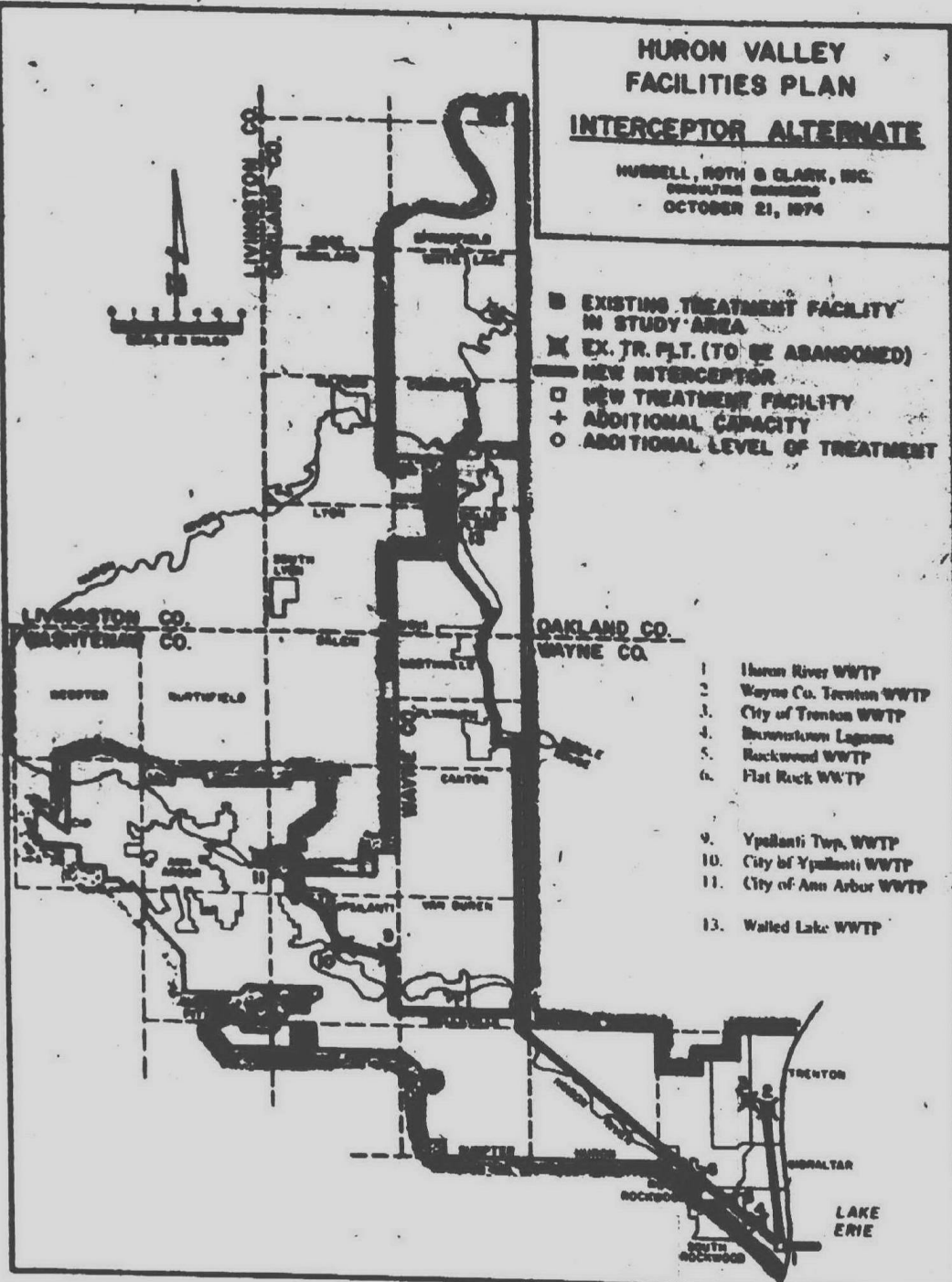
Two days of hearings will begin Wednesday, Dec. 11, on legislation introduced by U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Eath (R-Ann Arbor) to guard against deterioration of the ozone layer in the atmosphere.

A congressional committee will question scientists Wednesday about their warnings that a common chemical used in aerosol sprays may be destroying a portion of the atmosphere which protects the earth from hazardous ultra violet rays.

The hearings are designed to put on the record what facts we have available," explains Rep. Paul G. Rogers (D-Florida), chairman of the Commerce Committee's sub-

committee on public health and environment.

"The legislation calls for a more extensive investigation to be conducted by the National Academy of Sciences. If the NAS findings agree with those conclusions which our scientific witnesses have put forth, then we will have to move to halt the destruction of ozone."



THE ALTERNATIVE favored by Wayne County officials is the Huron Valley Facilities Interceptor Alternate with a connecting sewer line from Commerce running south through Northville, Plymouth, Canton and branching west to Ann Arbor and east to Lake Erie.

## Drive for Indians needs extra help

This has been a tougher than average year for many Michigan Indians, according to the local folks who conduct a drive to aid them twice a year.

Work at resorts has been down because of the gasoline shortage, and factory employment possibilities in Michigan's remote northern regions are few, says Hank Chruscial, chairman of the Indian affairs committee of the Western Wayne County Conservation Association.

New toys, canned food, clean and repaired clothing, dental care items and household goods are being collected at Chruscial's home, 19345 Brentwood, Livonia.

Kate Ridley, a nurse at Betsford Hospital in Farmington Hills, has collected food and clothing both at the hospital and at area libraries.

Trinity Church of the Brethren in Redford has put up a mitten tree and set up food baskets.

Montgomery Ward of Winderland Center has donated toys. Three other area retailers who asked to remain anonymous also contributed toys.

Turn Avers, 11, and Brad Kelson, 13, collected cans of food by the wheelbarrow in their Livonia neighborhood.

He and apprentices from Ironworkers Local 25 will deliver them during the Christmas season to Indian settlements near Muskegon, Petoskey, the Indian Mission School at Harbor Springs and Cross Village.

The Indian center at Traverse City distributes the goods to needy families in the area. The Holy Childhood school at Harbor Springs is a mostly-resident school for children from broken homes or poor families.

BRYANT JUNIOR High in Livonia is one place where the student council has voted its commitment to participate in helping the Indians.

But Gary Sarut, student council advisor, insists the youngsters shouldn't solicit cans of food from the neighbors. "It doesn't take a large, overt effort to help. If every kid brought one can of food, that would be 900 cans right there."

The goal at Bryant is for students to think about others at Christmas time, he said, and for everyone to participate.

Bryant's drive ends Wednesday.

AMONG OTHER recent donations: Greenfield United Methodist Church of Detroit contributed 63 items of food and soap.

## Westland parking snowed in

Expanded parking lots at Westland Center were snowed in just one day after they were completed.

The newly repaved and painted lots on the western side of the center were finished Nov. 30 — in time for the area's blizzard of the century.

The snow put a damper on holiday shopping for a few days, but were cleared to handle an expected onslaught of last-minute shoppers.

The lots were regarded and repaved this fall to allow for construction of about 34 new stores and a major department store, scheduled to open in 1975 and 1976.

The expansion project will push the total number of stores and services from 54 to about 90 by late fall 1976.

Depending upon weather conditions and delivery of materials, building construction will begin in January.

# Expenses light for candidates in fall election

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—While political campaign expenses are in themselves controversial political issues, only one local candidate could even claim a contribution of \$100.

Biggest spender and benefactor in the November campaign was Thomas Sullivan, unsuccessful candidate for trustee.

In his expense filing report, Sullivan listed \$250.58 in contributions which matched his \$250.53 expense report.

James Sullivan of 19544 Wood, Melvindale, made the \$100 contribution. Other contributors included Earl Dey, \$50; Lloyd Sharfand, \$84 and Barbara Sullivan, \$36.53.

Sullivan's largest single expense was an Observer & Eccentric ad which cost \$110.04. Sullivan's other expenses were itemized as being less than \$50 individually.

The three other trustee candidates each reported campaign expenses and contributions as less than \$100.

Frank Millington, who secured a trustee seat, listed his only expense as

an Observer & Eccentric ad totaling \$33.00. He listed no contributions and no unpaid debts.

Richard Gornick, who won the other trusteeship, reported his expenses as less than \$100 and listed no unpaid debts or contributions.

Defeated trustee Orville Tungate listed his only expense as a \$10 Plymouth Community Crier ad. He reported no contributions or debts.

Both re-elected supervisor J.D. McLaren and clerk Helen Richardson, who ran unopposed, listed no contributions, debts or expenses.

Newly elected treasurer Joseph H. West reported \$82.72 in campaign expenses, with the largest itemized cost as \$37.02 to Plymouth Secretarial Service for the printing of cards.

West received \$30 in contributions and claimed no debts.

Defeated treasurer candidate Janet Pierangelino listed her only expense as a \$10 Plymouth Community Crier ad. She reported no unpaid debts or contributions.

## Prof finds moral standards shift

It's enough to make Babbitt spin in his grave, the morality shift in mid-America.

Increased sexuality and use of illicit drugs, alcohol and tobacco among midwestern adolescents from 1970 through 1973 has been reported by a

Michigan State University professor. At the same time, he said, the adolescents showed an increased interest in religion.

ARTHUR M. VENER, MSU professor of social science, reported on the "significant changes" found in the study he has been conducting since 1970 with Cyrus S. Stewart, also of MSU, of the social-psychological behavior of some 4,220 teen-agers in

three western Michigan communities. Also sharing the MSU study has been Mary Margaret Zaenglein of the MSU department.

Vener presented their findings at a joint meeting of the American Sociological Association and the Society for the Study of Social Problems at McGill University.

Using identical measures of adolescent behavior in their on-going survey of three schools in a western Michigan school system, Vener and his colleagues found increased sexual activity among both girls and boys between the ages of 13 and 19. Further, the sexual behavior related to delinquent behavior in general.

Vener said their findings paralleled those of national studies.

THE SEX behavior, Vener said, also related to a lack of commitment to traditional institutions like police, religious orthodoxy and schools.

Vener cautioned that while their study offered no evidence of a "long-run major revolution" in adolescent

sex, they did find moderately significant increases in sex involvement at the ages of 14 and 15, and viewed the increases as "indicative of an upward, long-run evolutionary change."

"The findings underscore our initial impression that substantial change occurred in the social climate of the school system over the three-year period."

"Particularly in the high school, dress and adornment was more casual, less deference was shown to teachers and administrative officials, more informal student interaction occurred in and out of classrooms, and more egalitarianism and mutual respect was shown."

The double standard in sex reached matching percentages among boys and girls in 1973, compared to an 11 per cent difference in 1970.

Communities involved are predominantly white, ranging from upper-working to upper-middle socioeconomic levels, and not part of a large metropolitan complex.

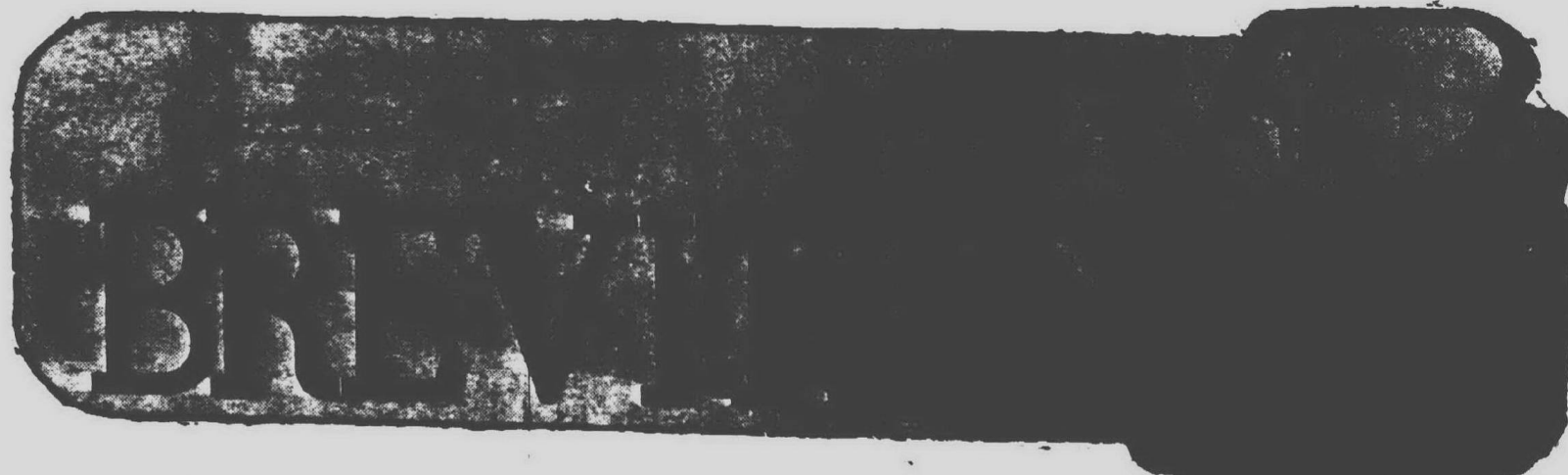

# Christmas walk includes safari

**PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP**—Memories of jungles, mountain slopes and wild bush country line the walls of the Jack Selle residence at 12816 Beacon Hill.

Heads, skins and stuffed bodies of animals, who once hunted and stalked the plains of Africa, Hawaii, North and Central America, silently snarl side-by-side in the room the Selles have reserved for them.

"I can sit here and look at each one of these animals and tell you all about where and when I shot them," said Jack Selle, owner of Jack Selle Buick, Inc., as he lounged in the sunken menagerie of his safari room. "These are things you never forget."

AMONG SELLE'S collection is the huge brown head of a cape buffalo, which he shot in Tanzania and terms one of the most dangerous of beasts.

Nearby are mounted the heads of a nyala and cape hartebeest, whose enormous size gained entrance in the 1971 edition of the Rowland World Record of Big Game book.

Striped zebra skins and cougar and bear rugs are scattered on the floor under the watchful eye of moose, wild boar, impala, oryx and caribou heads. The stuffed body of a jaguar, which Selle shot in Central America, ferociously guards the stone fireplace.

"I think the leopard was probably the most tricky animal to get," said Selle, as he eyed the dotted skin sprawled across a sofa. "Leopards are probably the sneakiest, quietest and fastest of animals. We spent several days on that one."

Selle pointed out the enormous pair of ivory elephant tusks that frame the hearth of the fireplace and an elephant ear, thrown on the floor as an area rug. One gray and wrinkled elephant foot serves as a foot stool, while another hollow foot is stuffed with plants.

"That takes a lot of stalking," Selle said of the elephant. "It's a very thick-skinned animal with a good sense of smell and hearing. You've got to hit him hard in the right spot, and you've got to do it quickly. You don't shoot unless you're sure you're on target. You don't want to cripple an animal."

SELLE BEGAN hunting in the woods of Michigan about 30 years ago.

"I just started hunting pheasants and ducks and up to Ontario for bear. Probably most hunters don't go farther than that because it's a very expensive hobby."

Selle still hunts deer and pheasants in Michigan, but more extensive hunting trips have taken him to Kenya, Mozambique, Tanzania, Colorado, Alaska and Hawaii.

Selle has embarked on three African safaris with a crew of about ten natives and a professional "white hunter," who makes arrangements for equipment and supplies. Each trip lasts about a month, but must be planned about a year in advance to obtain permits and licenses from the proper government.

Selle said he hunts for two reasons—the trophy and the thrill of danger.

"We don't go just to be shooting. You shoot and hunt for particularly large animals. The frightening part is the thrill. It just makes it more interesting."

"It isn't as easy as it looks on television. Those television shows are filmed in the game parks where the animals are not as wild."

Selle recalled one incident when he and his crew were stalking buffalo.

"They decided to turn around and stalk us. That was a pretty scary experience."

In another incident, Selle sat next to an 18-foot python while stalking a beast.

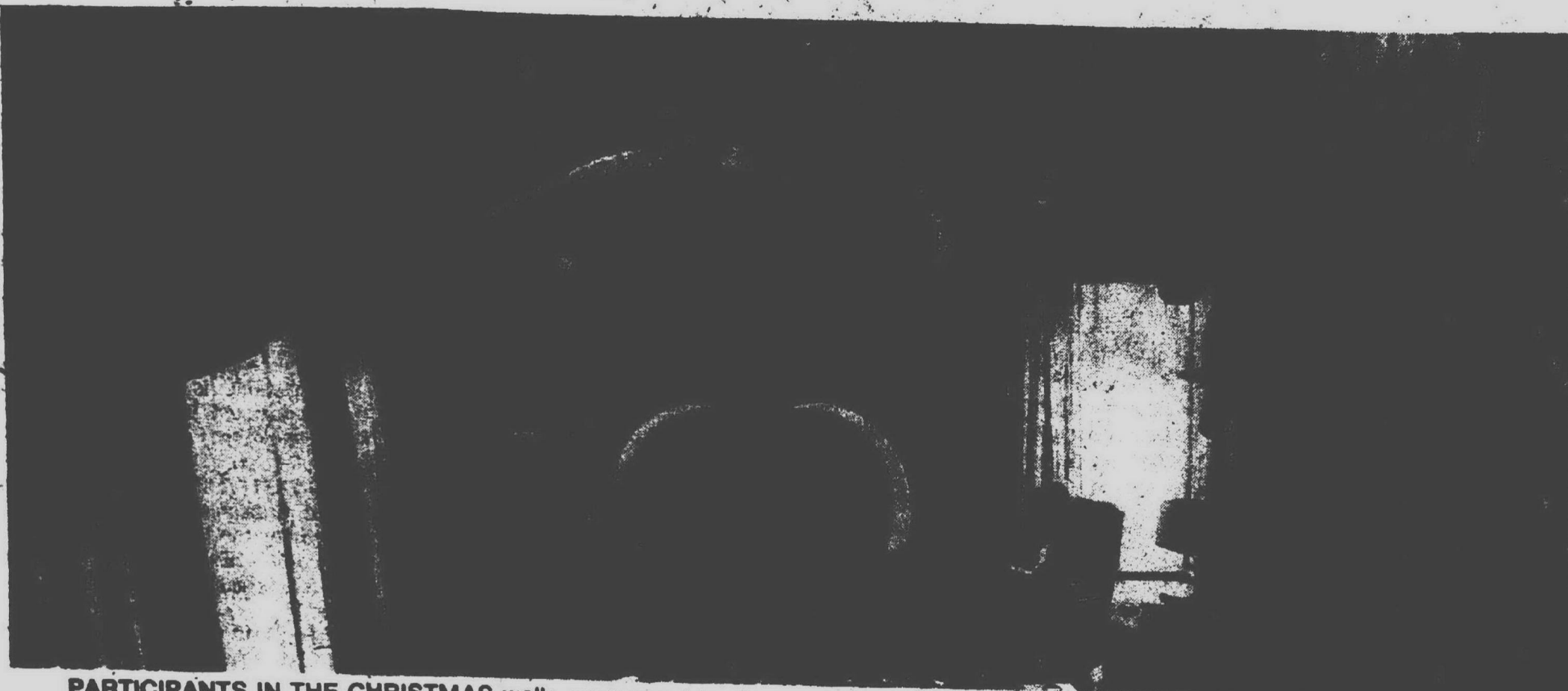
ALTHOUGH THE hunt encompasses a hard day's work, Selle said life back at the camp is easy and comfortable.

The crew provides clean laundry and delicious food daily, and a shower bag, filled with fresh water, always hangs from a nearby tree. The "white hunter" is the only person with whom Selle can talk, however, because he is the only person who can speak English.

Selle maintains that hunting conserves species of animals. African governments use expensive license and permit fees to promote conservation measures, he said, and game scouts often accompany hunting parties to differentiate between animals that can and cannot be shot. Selle only shoots male animals too old to reproduce.

"It's good conservation to shoot these animals. It's selective harvesting, and it's helping to build a stronger herd. It gives more land for grazing and turns the herd over to a younger buck."

The Selles' safari room, featuring animal skins and about 33 heads, is one of six stops scheduled for the Plymouth Women's Farm and Garden Association's Christmas walk on Thursday, Dec. 12. The stop is entitled "The Peaceable Kingdom."

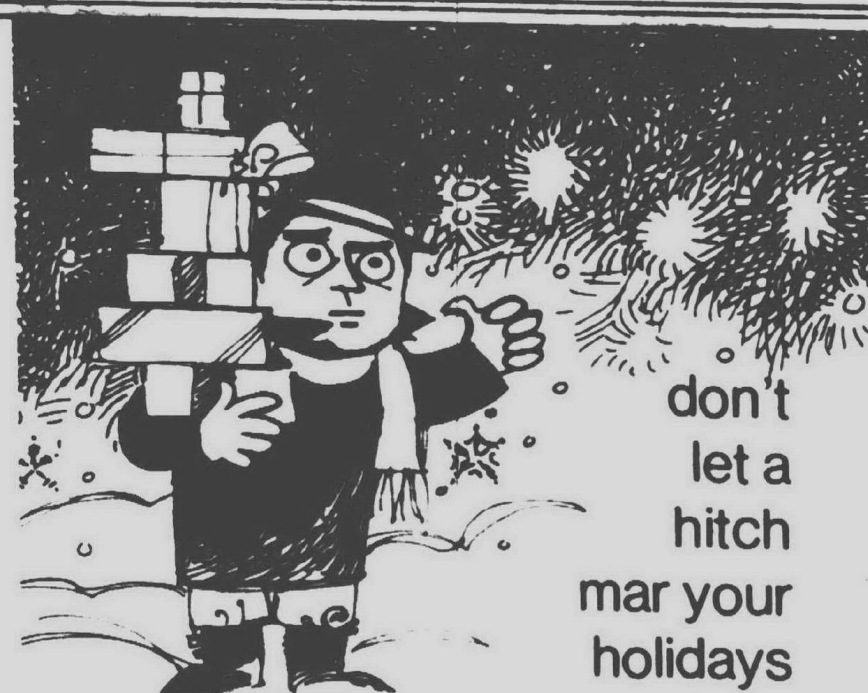

ALSO FEATURED on this concert

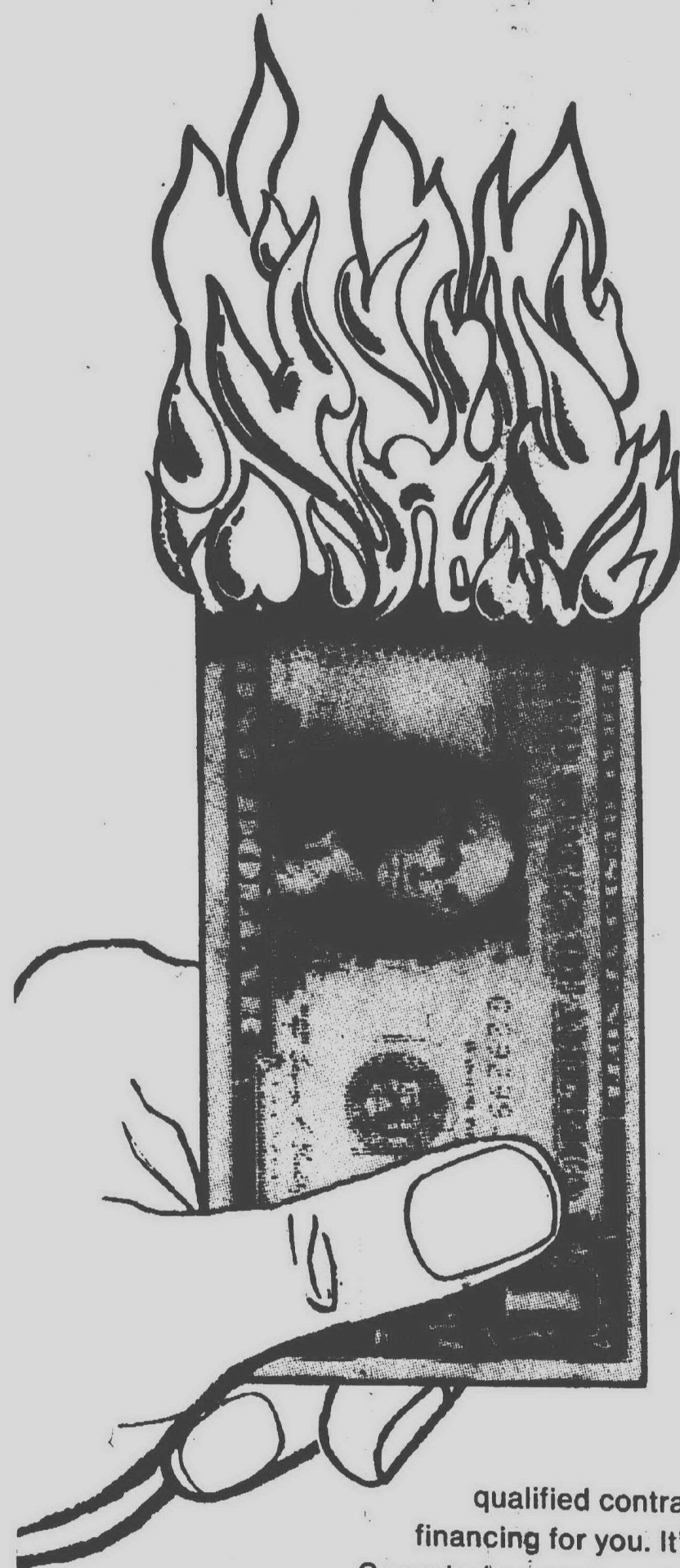
will be Jim Hewett, senior bassoonist who will perform the first movement of the "Bassoon Concerto in F major" by C.M. Von Weber, op. 75.

# Metroparks offer winter fun

Five Metroparks of the Haren-Clin-ton Metropolitan Authority will offer the following facilities for winter recreation, available when Michigan's winter weather arrives.

**METROPOLITAN BEACH** Metropark on Lake St. Clair near Mt. Clemens is one of Michigan's best-known perch fishing areas, with outdoorsmen using the canals, boat basins, Black Creek and Lake St. Clair.

This year general skating and hockey rinks will be located on the North Boat Basin open 10 a.m. to dusk, with general skating until 10 p.m. (weather permitting). Heated restrooms are provided at the South Marina Building and at a comfort station near the North Marina. This season the food bar is open Saturday and Sunday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. (Closed weekdays).

Cross-country skiers may use the level terrain. Ice boaters may launch their craft at the west end of the waterfront along Lake St. Clair, with limited parking available at this site. There is space for over 6,000 cars at the main parking lot. Park hours are 8 a.m. to dusk, except when ice skating is available until 10 p.m.

**STONY CREEK** Metropark near Utica offers ice fishing, ice skating, sledding, cross country skiing and hiking areas throughout the 3,500-acre park. Panfish, bass and pike inhabit

Stony Creek Lake. Park hours are 8 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Ice skating is available on Stony Creek Lake at the boat launching site and Winter Cove Picnic Area, with each site providing a warming shelter and heated restrooms. The boat launching site has vending machines for snacks weekdays and a food bar open weekends. Several hills throughout the park provide natural slopes for sledding, with use at each site depending upon snow cover. Located six miles north of Utica, the park entrance is along 26 Mile Road, about 2 1/2 miles west of M-50 (Van Dyke) Freeway.

**KENSINGTON** Metropark near Milford is one of the most popular areas in southeastern Michigan and has facilities for tobogganing, skating, sledding, cross-country skiing and picture taking. Catches of bluegills, crappies and pike are taken by fishermen who test their skill on Kent Lake.

Skating hours are 10 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. daily (weather permitting) and the rinks are located in front of the boat rental building, open 2 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. Saturday, Sunday and holidays during the Christmas vacation (Monday, Dec. 23 through Wednesday, January 1, weather permitting). This building has a heated lounge with a fireplace, restrooms,

food service and vending machines.

Ideal for sledding and tobogganing are the hilly slopes at the winter sports area, which has an enclosed warming shelter with a fireplace and tables. There are five toboggan runs and a separate area for sledding. The area is open daily from 10 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.

**LOWER HURON** Metropark near Belleville. Sledding and tobogganing is available on moderate slopes in the park. Cross country skiing is popular.

Three natural rink surfaces are provided at inter-connected ponds, located in a ravine where skating is permitted daily until 10 p.m. (weather permitting). Recorded music, light and wood for rinkside fires are provided. Nearby are heated restrooms. Park hours are daylight to 10 p.m. The park entrance is on Hannan Road, just one-half mile south of the I-94 Expressway, between Detroit Metropolitan Airport and Belleville interchanges.

**WILLOW** Metropark near New Boston. Primary winter sports attractions include cross country skiing and the hill for sledding and tobogganing at the Chestnut Picnic Area site. To reach the park, travel along Huron River Drive southeast of New Boston, to Willow Road. The entrance is along Willow Road between Huron River Drive and Bell Road.

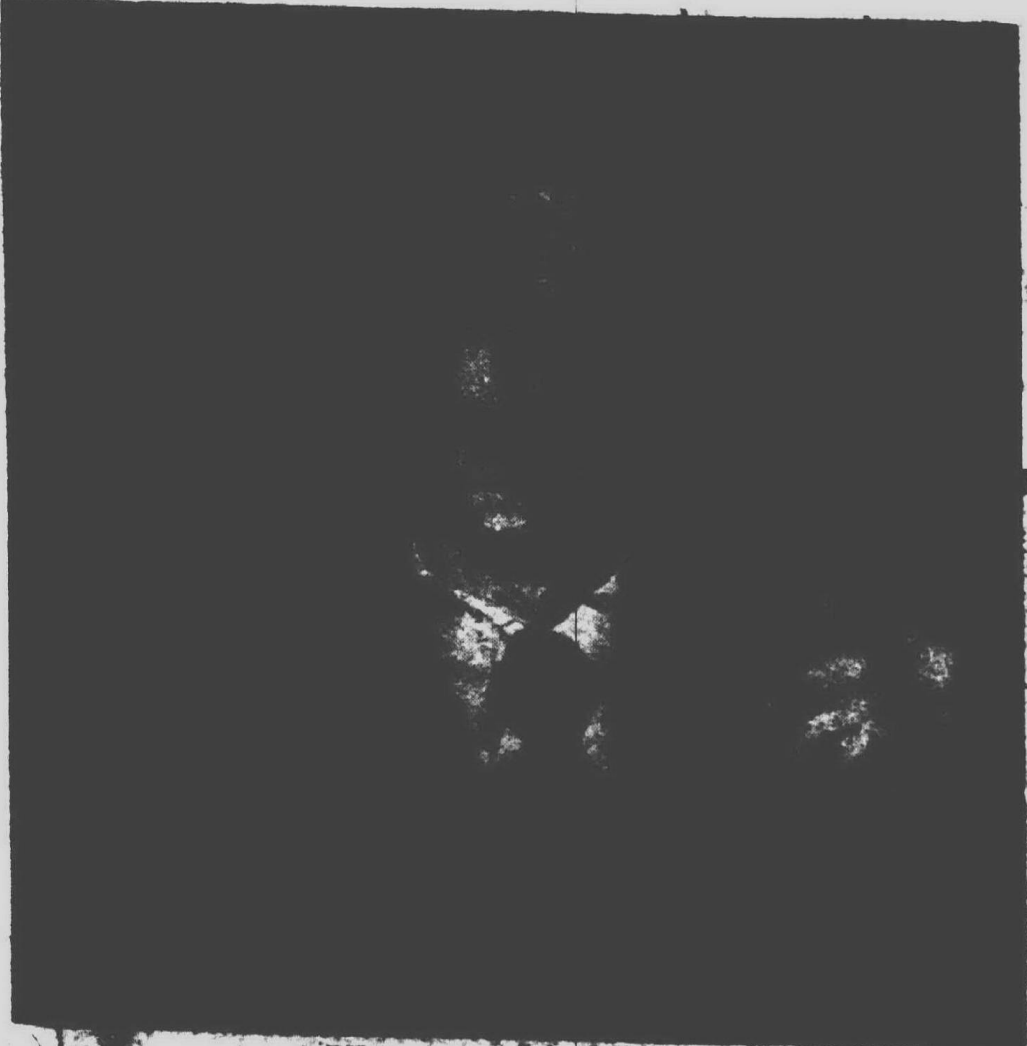

## Eclipse on the way

A partial solar eclipse on Friday the 13th and the official beginning of winter highlight the astronomical events for December, according to University of Michigan astronomer Hazel M. Losh.

The partial eclipse of the sun will be visible over most of North America on the morning of Dec. 13, Prof. Losh says. During the time of greatest eclipse, more than 80 per cent of the sun's diameter will be covered by the dark moon. Solar eclipses occur when the moon is at new phase, and passes between the earth and the sun, blotting out part of the sun from view.

"THE MOON usually in its monthly course misses the sun. But at certain times the new phase will occur near the intersection of the two orbits, and the moon will blot out the sun, which is what happens on the 13th," she says.

The eclipse will begin at 9:04 a.m. Eastern Standard Time, when the eastern edge of the moon touches the western edge of the sun. As the moon's orbit continues, more and more of the sun will be covered until the maximum eclipse at 11:13 a.m. The eclipse will be over at 1:23 p.m.

Winter will officially arrive Dec. 22 at 12:57 a.m. EST, when the sun arrives at the winter solstice, the most southerly point during its yearly journey around the earth. On that day, there will be 15 hours of dark-

ness and only nine of daylight. After that day, the sun will begin back north and the days will lengthen.

"The eastern sky is host to some of the most beautiful and colorful stars of the year" in December, Prof. Losh says.

AMONG THE brightest are the yellow Capella in Auriga; the orange Aldebaran in Taurus; the giant red Betelgeuse on the shoulder of Orion; the bright Rigel in Orion's knee; the Twins, Castor and Pollux, and the brilliant Sirius.

Sirius can be located on a line drawn downward through Orion's three Belt stars, Prof. Losh explains. "From time immemorial, Sirius has been watched, admired and revered, rising as it does in early evening around Christmas time. It was the 'Star of the East,' pointed to by the Three Wise Men or Orion," she says. Sirius is in the constellation of Canis Major, the dog of Orion.

The Northern Cross, moving toward the west during the month, will be silhouetted after dark against the northwestern sky on Christmas eve, Prof. Losh says.

She adds that Venus will emerge as an evening planet during December, and Jupiter will continue to be the conspicuous object in the Southwest sky during evening hours. Saturn, in the constellation of Gemini, shines all night during the month.

## Gourmet cook creates with alacrity

Whether it's luncheon for two or a midnight supper for 100, gourmet cook Carol Worsley of Birmingham can turn out a meal with the greatest of ease.

"I've been doing it so long, it's second nature to me now," says Mrs. Worsley. "Entertaining is my forte. I love to entertain. First I think of what to serve, then I think of who to invite."

Mrs. Worsley and her husband Donald entertain "on the grand scale" in the home he designed at 611 Tooting Lane.

She also teaches French cooking in her apple-green and white kitchen. Two classes of 20 women and men meet for an afternoon each week. She has a waiting list of 160 names.

**A BUSY VOLUNTEER** at schools the three Worsley children attend, she is teaching a two-session course "French Cooking au Provençal" in her home this month. These classes are all filled.

Mrs. Worsley started baking when she was a little girl in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. "Mother was a marvelous cook," she says.

Today Mrs. Worsley, who is essentially a homemaker, cooks with the great cooks of the world. Recently she attended a week-long "gathering of the cooks" in California's Napa Valley.

The \$1,500 session, which included everything, was hosted by her good friend Michael James of Michael James' Cooks, San Francisco.

**ANOTHER FRIEND.** Simone "Simca" Beck of France taught the sessions, "Mastering the Art of French Cooking in California."

During the summer, Mrs. Worsley assists Ailene Martin, a Glen Lake neighbor, who teaches cooking to women from all over the U.S.

Blond, talkative and full of vitality, Mrs. Worsley relates how her cooking career progressed.

"I went to Japan with my husband when I was 19. He was in the Navy, and entertaining was very formal. I was making homemade coffee cakes.

"I ALWAYS loved to cook. I saw how they entertained. I had this feeling for it."

Mrs. Worsley took her first French cooking course at the embassy. When she and her husband moved to Birmingham, "I took all the cooking courses here that I

could. Sometimes I'd take the same course twice."

Preparing luncheon for two while she talks, Mrs. Worsley shakes a hot loaf of bread, stirs a bowl of soup ("I like to have soup on the back burner").

She has gone from haute cuisine to Provençal, or simple country French, in her cooking classes. Students range from those who have never cooked before to those who have cooked for 25 years.

"I provide inspiration," she explains.

**A PROVENÇAL** luncheon menu she puts together quickly, that is both eye-appealing and palate-pleasing, includes Camembert en Croute with Fruit, Tomato Soupe a la Provençale, Dill-Herb Bread, Carol's Green Salad with Citrus Fruits, Richard Olney's Chicken (Poulet au Roti et Epinard) and Kahlua Chocolate Mousse. A French white burgundy wine is served with the meal.

### CAMEMBERT EN CROUTE

1/2 cup sifted all-purpose flour  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
2 oz. cream cheese (1/4 cup)  
1 egg yolk  
1/4 cup butter or regular margarine

1 Camembert cheese 7-8 oz., 4 inches in diameter and 1 inch high

Make pastry at least one day before. Sift flour with salt into medium bowl. With pastry blender, cut in cream cheese and butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs.

Shape pastry into a ball; flatten slightly, wrap in plastic film or bag. Refrigerate overnight.

It's best to make Camembert en Croute about three hours before serving.

On lightly floured pastry cloth or board, roll out pastry to 1/8 inch (not less) thickness.

With pastry wheel or knife, cut out a seven-inch circle, place on cookie sheet. Set Camembert cheese in center of circle. Bring pastry up around side and 1/2 inch over top of cheese, taking care not to stretch or tear pastry and pressing pastry smooth.

Roll out trimmings. With a pastry wheel, cut out a circle to fit top of cheese exactly.

In a small bowl, with a fork, beat egg yolk and two teaspoons water. Brush some of egg mixture on pastry rim around top edge of cheese. Place pastry circle on top.

With pastry wheel, cut two strips, five inches long and 1/2 inch wide, and three leaves from remaining pastry. Roll up each strip, to resemble a rosebud. Place with leaves, in center of pastry. Brush top and decoration lightly with rest of egg mixture.

Refrigerate at least one hour before baking. Preheat oven to 425°.

Bake 20 minutes, or until pastry is golden-brown. Let cool on cookie sheet on wire rack at room temperature 30 minutes. Remove to serving board or plate. Garnish with fruit—apples, pears, plums, peaches, grapes.

Cut cheese in wedges and serve on small plates.

Makes six servings.

### CAROL'S GREEN SALAD WITH CITRUS FRUITS

1 large head Romain  
1 Belgian Endive  
1 bunch curly endive  
Fresh grapefruit segments  
Fresh orange segments

1 avocado, peeled and sliced  
1 medium red onion, sliced thinly

Freshly made crouton, from good bread, tossed with butter and garlic salt.

Prepare salad greens. Tear greens into bowl, leaving small leaves whole. Add red onion, grapefruit, orange and avocado. Toss croutons on top after adding the dressing.

### Dressing

1/4 cup sugar  
1 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. paprika  
1 tsp. mustard  
1/4 tsp. pepper  
1/4 cup lemon juice  
3/4 cup salad oil  
1 tsp. celery seed  
1 tsp. grated onion  
1 clove of garlic  
2 tbs. honey

Beat with rotary beater, mix in blender or in covered jar. Keep in refrigerator.

"I designed this salad dressing especially to compliment a green salad with citrus fruits. I prefer doing it in the blender because then you add the onion and garlic whole and let the blender do the work."

### KAHLUA CHOCOLATE MOUSSE

Place in blender: Four eggs, dash of salt and one 12-oz. package of chocolate chips. Mix on high until ingredients are blended. Melt slowly on top of stove, one cup sugar plus one cup of water (takes 5-10 minutes).

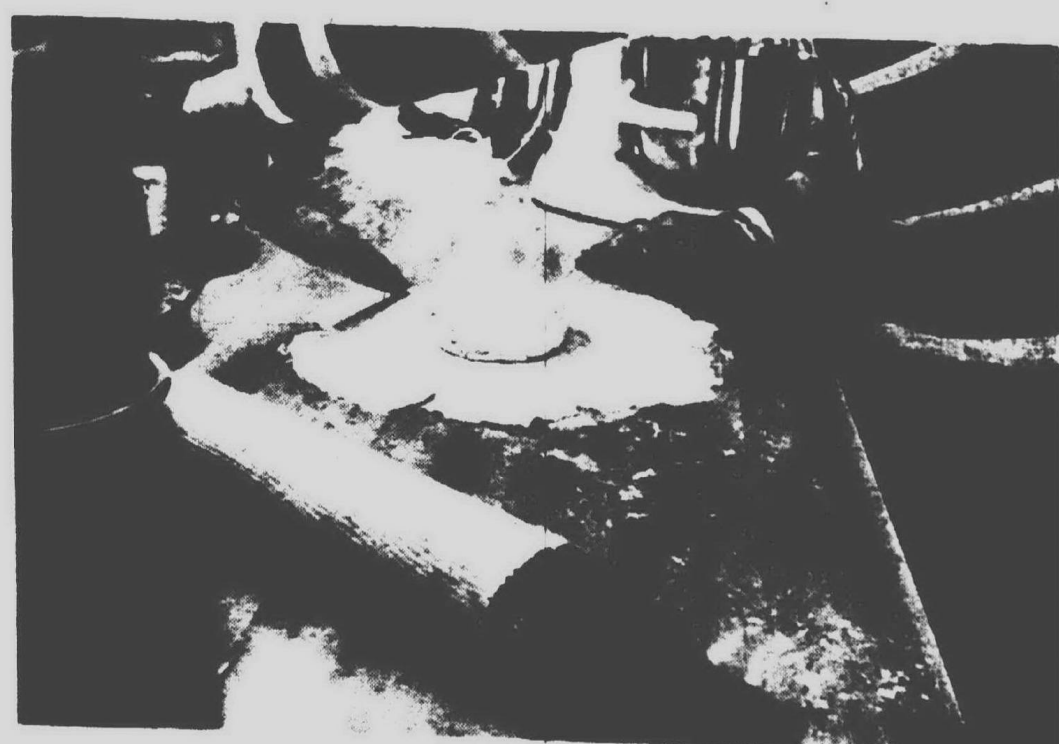
Add sugar mixture to the chocolate mixture in the blender, slowly, in a thin stream, with the blender at the highest possible speed.

Add: 1/4 cup Kahlua and 1/4 cup good cognac and let it cool in the refrigerator.

When cool, beat two cups of whipping cream until almost stiff and fold the chocolate mixture into the whipping cream.

Pour into a level crystal bowl and garnish with whipping cream and chocolate curls.

Leave in refrigerator overnight. Serve chilled.

## Cuisine and Duglass

My Christmases always included my dog Shep. For as long as I can remember, I was his best buddy.

There were some days when we were inseparable. How I used to enjoy his soft, sensuous sable-colored coat nestled beside my legs beneath the dining table, lapping up any gastronomical rejects I might have to offer. With all the pizzazz that went with holiday eating, there was one dish in particular that we savored most of all.

The scent of roasting pork loin will live forever, stuffed through to the center with cranberries and resting on a bed of fresh radiant red apples and crimson cabbage all basting in a broth of ruby port.

This made the nostrils of my collie dog Shep point directly at me, with his big brown eyes, tilted head and pointed ears in a position that would send warning goodness to my heart.

IF I HAD TO choose a time in this life that I liked most of all it would be with Shep at the dining table sharing my roast pork and cranberries.

On a day early in the spring of that year he walked me to the corner en route to school.

I never saw him again.

### ROAST LOIN OF PORK NOSTALGIA

1 loin of pork boned from 8-10 or 10-12 lbs.  
This will feed about 12 people. It can be bought and divided into chops and stored for another occasion. If so, use the center for this recipe. What you could do is follow this large recipe and cut it down the center or whatever, and roast according to your gathering.

- 1 package fresh cranberries
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 can frozen orange juice defrosted
- 1 large jar red cabbage
- 2 fresh delicious apples cored and chopped
- 1/2 tsp. ground cloves
- 1 egg
- Pinch dry mustard
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/4 lb. unsalted butter
- 1 tbsp. flour
- Juice of 1/2 lemon
- Domestic ruby port
- 1 1/2 cups bread crumbs
- 1/4 lb. ground pork

Melt butter, add sugar and cranberries, cook for 2 minutes or until mixture becomes somewhat of a syrup. Sprinkle in flour and stir. This will become like a thick pudding.

The important thing here is to cook out the flour taste.

Add orange juice and lemon, cook for a minute more, remove from stove and add egg. Salt to taste and stir. Add the bread crumbs and pork mix.

Preparing the loin is simple. After the butcher has boned it out, have him open it up into a flat piece of meat like a rolled roast. Trim as much fat as possible and save it for the top when roasting.

Season with a mixture of mustard, cinnamon cloves and kosher salt on both sides. Spread cranberry stuffing with a cake spatula over entire meat.

ROLL LIKE a jelly roll and tie with some butcher's twine. Now read carefully. The roast is in front of you all rolled up as tightly as possible. Check?

Take twine and tie a bow or a knot one inch from the end on the right hand side. If you are a lefty then just reverse the procedure. Your left hand is over the top of the meat with twine in right hand.

Bring twine over left palm and down under meat. At the same time lift palm slightly and pull string under meat.

Continue this method working left tie at the end. This is a very simple way once you get to know the ropes.

Set in a roasting pan and cook at 350 degrees F. for one hour. Add cabbage, apples and one-half bottle of port; cover and cook one-half hour more at 325 degrees F. Fresh cabbage may be used. If so, then add all the above ingredients at once and cover only for the first half hour.

### LA SAUCE

Strain drippings into a sauce pot, add 1 cup of water and bring to a boil. Darken slightly with caramel color. Make a binding agent with equal parts soft butter and flour mixed with your fingers. This is called Beurre Manie. It's great for thickening liquids to sauces.

This is a good thing to have in your kitchen so make 1/4 lb. butterworth. When adding to sauces just start with a teaspoon, it goes a long way.

If there seems to be an excess of rendered fat from the roast, skim it off with a soup ladle and use for the Beurre Manie, instead of butter.

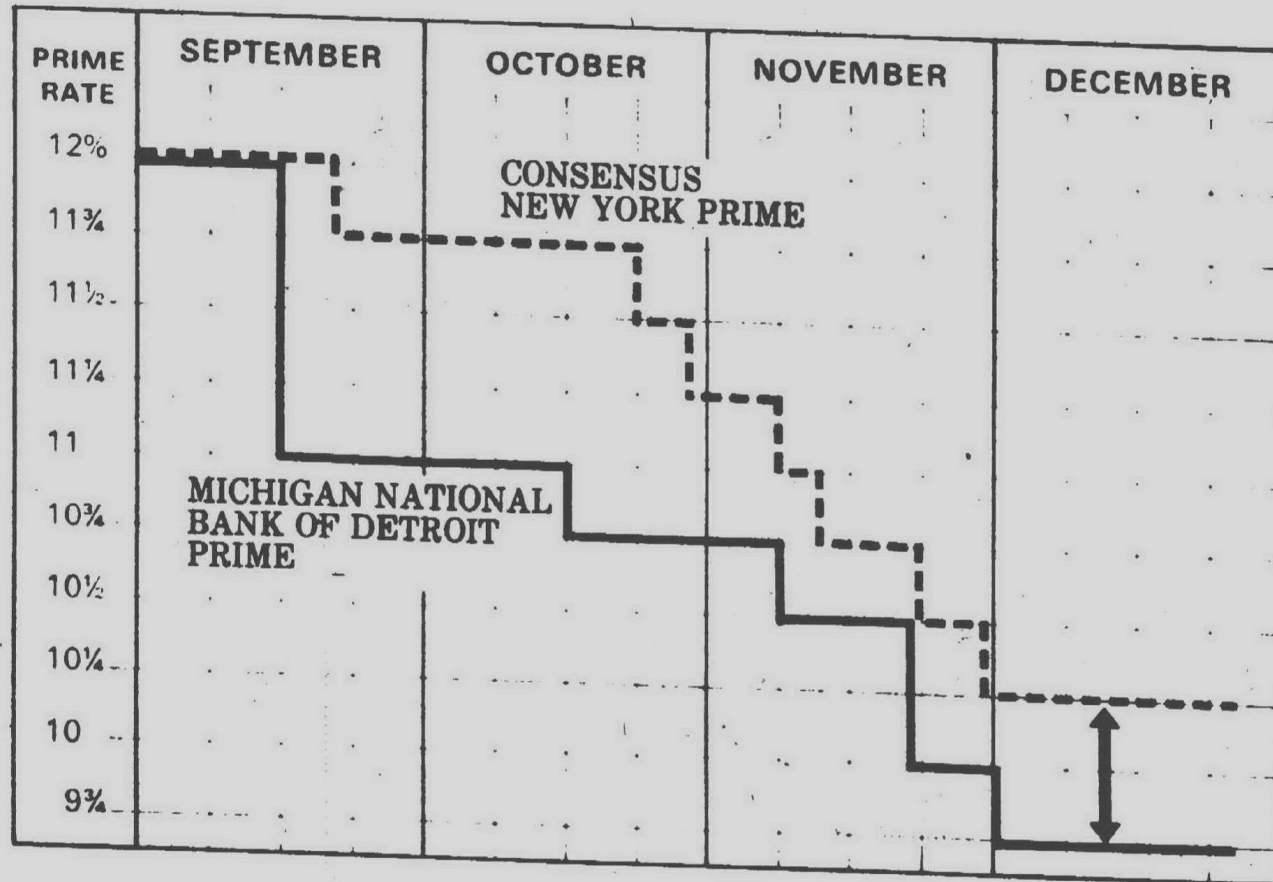
Serve 'em taste.

If a velvet texture is desired then add spoonfuls of soft sweet butter by whisking.

Cranberries are named after the birds that eat them, Cranes. Their closest living relative would be the blueberry.

### The Stroller

#### Snowstorm made history

It will be a long time before any of us forgets the 19-inch snowfall that gripped our area on Dec. 1, 1974.

That date now will be written into the record books and in the years to come the weathermen on the TV tubes, the radio and other avenues of communication will be making comparisons each time there is more than the average storm in these Michigan winters.

The Stroller can almost hear them now, saying, "This is the worst storm we've had since 1974," just as the weathermen did recently in recounting almost every half hour that this year's storm was the worst since 1882.

Because of this, Dec. 1 will take its place with other December dates such as Pearl Harbor Day on Dec. 7 and Christmas on Dec. 25 — unless the government alters the Yuletide date to give the working forces a longer holiday.

Yet, with all the emphasis on the date of the snow it will not match the days of yore when family histories were written around the quirks of Mother Nature — instead of calendars as is done today.

THIS MAY sound strange to the present generation, but The Stroller never learned the date of his paternal grandfather's birth or that of his paternal grandmother.

Both of them were born near County Derry, Ireland, and came over to America and settled in our home town when a Welshman named David Thomas built a furnace to start the making of pig iron with anthracite coal.

Any time we youngsters would ask him when he was born—in the hope that we could celebrate his birthday—he'd answer:

"I was born in the year of the big wind."

That was no help at all. But that was as much as he knew of his birth. When he died there was the question as to what to have cut on the grave marker.

Finally, it was decided, so our father told us, to make a guess at the year he was born and forget about the day and the month.

It was the same with The Stroller's grandmother. When asked her birth date she'd answer:

"I was born the year of the big flood."

So, we youngsters never knew the birthday of our grandparents—because their life history was recorded only by Mother Nature's antics.

WOULDN'T IT be odd if the youngsters born now would have their births recorded with the simple statement—"Born the year of the big snow?"

The Stroller well recalls some of the big snows in his span of years and one in particular stands out.

It came on a Saturday night when he was about 12 years old. At the time, the entire family was engaged in a contest to see which of us could set an attendance record in Sunday School.

Came Sunday morning and the ground was covered to a depth of almost two feet and double that in places it had drifted.

Starting for Sunday school, The Stroller was doing fine for about a city block. Then it happened. He got stuck in one of the drifts.

It wasn't so much being stuck in the snow that bothered him. It was the fact that he was going to miss Sunday school that caused big tears to stream down his cheeks. A kindly man, who knew the family well, came to the rescue and saw to it that he got to Sunday school despite the storm.

But the memory of it is all The Stroller has today. He can't recall the date. But if grandfather had been here and had anything to do with it he would have recorded it as "the year of the big snow!"

So it will be with Dec. 1, 1974. It will be remembered as the date of the 19-inch snowfall that hamstringing the entire community.

#### The ultimate expressway jam

I have a recurring fantasy of the ultimate traffic jam, a thousand or so cars locked bumper-to-bumper.

At the beginning of the line some guy is just entering his garage, at the end another driver is just heading out of his. It's permanent, you see, but nobody realizes it for a while.

Probably only a little tieup a couple of blocks ahead.

Last weekend it happened on the Toledo-Detroit expressway (U.S. 75). They blamed it on the snow, but it wasn't really that way.

The snow just slowed the cars, the critical mass of the expressway was exceeded, and that was that.

Then the snow covered it all up.

WHEN YOU DRIVE back from New York, your body begins a subtle rebellion near Cleveland. Fatigue, a buzzy feeling from too much coffee and a lack of concentration from too much car radio set in around Toledo. But it's almost home.

Pulling into a rest stop for one last cup before the short hop north was like walking into a refugee scene from a WW II movie.

Children in sleeping bags, knocked-out parents, dogs scrambling around the floor and a weary line at the sandwich counter came as a bit of a start.

The closed roads north, horror stories from truck drivers and the state patrol had turned the rest stop into an encampment.

The full weight sunk in slowly, as a

couple of transistor radios rasped out tales of churches, schools and other emergency shelters filling with stranded motorists.

"That's me," I realized. "I'm out here and they're talking about me."

One had the feeling the Detroit suburbs were mainly grandchildren, as family after family on the way home from Thanksgiving tried to settle in on the floor.

It was a bizarre scene of commerce and catastrophe. Lying on the floor, feeling every bone in contact with the commercial carpeting, one was kept awake by the ringing cash register in the snack line.

The lights went out, then back on as the shift changed. We spread out my son's blanket for a thin mat, and he snuggled up next to me.

In the morning, while we were eating half-cooked potatoes and wrapping up jellied toast, for the long siege, a waitress came over with one of those blue cards asking how we felt about the service.

I thought the mattresses were a bit thin.

THE CHILDREN explored every inch of the restaurant.

They found a vending machine in the restroom, which was empty, discovered a man with a television, who later disappeared, and ended with hide-and-seek.

Rumors ebbed and flowed. Two days? Three? It's been clear since 11

a.m.? No more food? Nothing but pancakes?

A state trooper confirmed a back road out of Toledo was moving by the end of the day and the route was mapped with a native of that city.

In the parking lot, the car wouldn't start. We dried the ignition wires on a radiator in the restaurant.

Moving again, the route was clear, and we drove through small towns I recognized from exit signs on the expressway.

THE CARNAGE from the storm was all around, cars buried by plows, skidded at improbable angles.

"Look," I started to say, and the car was sliding sideways, not even slowing until we had plowed deep into a snowbank.

It came out almost easily, with help from a passing motorist. I was jaded. A major crash was just another happening.

Turning into our street, the car slammed over an ice patch and the muffler tore off. Roaring in front of our house I got stuck again, freed it, got stuck again, left it.

I waded to the front step. The shovel was buried behind a garage door, drifted in. Borrowing another, I dug back to the car then dragged everyone to the house.

The next day I had a large lump on my head, and I still don't know where it came from.

#### Those joyrides are illegal

We've all heard stories about women about to have babies being taken from snowbound subdivisions by snowmobile.

But the statistical truth is that 99 per cent of the snowmobiles running around our side streets were on no errands of mercy whatsoever. Nor were they used by doctors. Nor were they used by mailmen.

Those snowmobiles were being used by joyriders, and they were being operated illegally. Snowmobiles may not be operated on city streets and most other roads in Michigan. There are a few northern rural roads that are closed to vehicular traffic in winter where snowmobiles may be

operated, but that doesn't apply to suburban subdivisions.

Operators of snowmobiles don't need licenses. They don't even need common sense, although that is certainly desirable. Youngsters 15 and under must have a state certificate to operate, one.

Many snowmobiles we saw, besides being illegally operated, were also foolishly operated: exceeding the speed limit, not stopping at stop signs, making a lot of racket and the like.

The police had many other things to do during the snowstorm, so the snowmobilers got away with a lot. But the mere fact they got away with something doesn't make it either legal or moral.

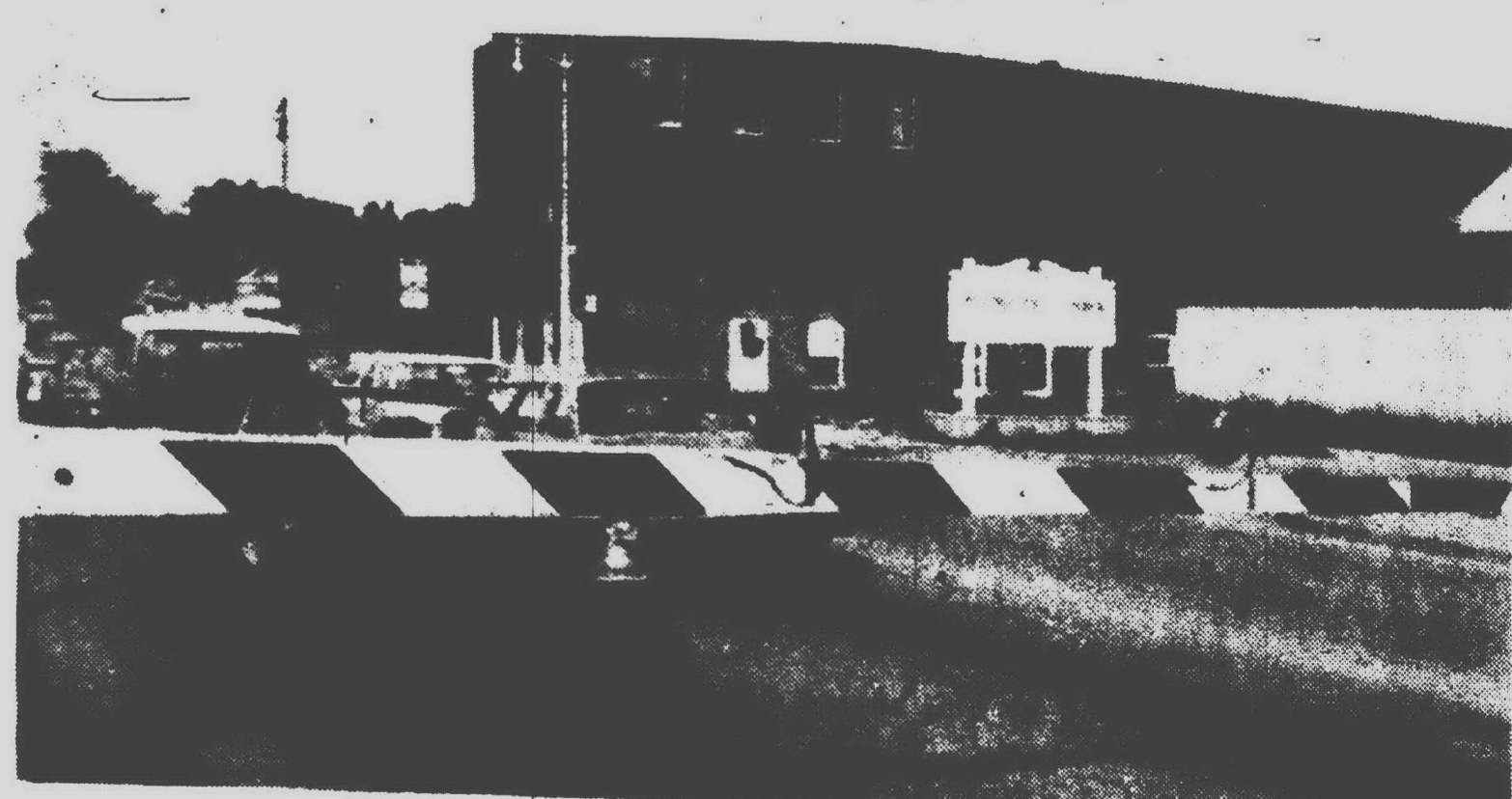


# Society snub sent him to Hollywood

Some said that William F. ("Phil") Markham, the air rifle pioneer, left Plymouth because the women of the community snubbed his second wife. Whatever his reason for moving to California, in 1911, Lady Luck went with him. After he had reached the age of 60, between 1911 and 1930, he made millions in Hollywood real estate.

Markham's odyssey began in England in 1851, the year Melville wrote his classic story of the wanderings of Captain Ahab and the white whale. By the 1880s, Phil Markham and his first wife, Carrie, with their two children, Leigh and Maude, were living on Easter Street in Plymouth.

Markham formed the Markham Manufacturing Company in Plymouth to make wooden tanks and cisterns. His ad in the Sept. 23, 1887, issue of the "Plymouth Mail" claimed that "4,000 of them are in use."



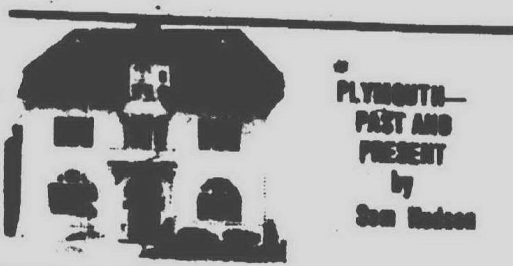
WHAT IS LEFT of the Markham Air Rifle Company building on Main Street near the railroad crossing. Markham sold out to Hough and Bennett of Daisy in 1911 and moved to

a rifle. He began making guns in 1885, securing a patent for his toy air rifle in August 1887. That was three years before Daisy got into the business.

It also was in 1887 that the name of Markham's firm was changed to Markham Air Rifle Company. In September of that year, Markham turned down an offer of \$10,000 from a Howell, Mich., minister who wanted to buy his patents.

E.S. Roe, vice president and superintendent of the plant, who was with Markham from the inception of the company, told Karl Starkweather that the first air rifle had no trade name until Markham sold a large quantity to a Chicago entrepreneur. A condition of the sale was that the gun bear the name "Chicago." The rifle, made primarily of wood, had considerable power, accuracy and dependability.

Markham's air rifle business prospered. He was able to build two fine homes in Plymouth. He rode to and from his Main Street plant in a fine landau drawn by two handsome bobtailed horses. He apparently had every reason to remain in Plymouth,



except one. He had marital problems. He wanted to marry his much-younger secretary, but his wife, a devout churchwoman, would not consent to a divorce.

When his first wife died, Markham did proceed to marry his secretary. They lived in the imposing white house on Penniman at Union, at the apex of Kellogg Park. Markham designed the structure itself, equipping it with fancy millwork, stained glass windows and velvet drapes. It was one of the first homes in Plymouth to be illuminated by gas, which was manufactured in the basement. The gardens had goldfish ponds and three pet deer.

The house Markham built for his first wife stood a stone's throw across the park, where the Box Bar is now located.

The women of Plymouth, who had sided with the first Mrs. Markham, refused to accept his second wife. Markham, who was then 60, decided to sell his holdings and pull up stakes. Leaving E. S. Roe to run his air rifle plant, in 1911 he moved to Hollywood.

Markham sold the big white house to George Wilcox, of the Wilcox Mill family. The house across the street was bought by Charles Mining. Markham's spirited bob-tails and buggy were purchased by Silas Sly in the summer of 1911. Markham's stable, with its hardwood box stalls, was bought by the Plymouth Grange from George Wilcox for \$3,000 in 1913. The remodelled stable, on Union Street, is still in use as the Grange Hall.

On Dec. 31, 1912, Edward C. Hough and Charles H. Bennett, prime movers at the Daisy Manufacturing Company, personally bought 90 per cent of the stock of the Markham Air Rifle Company. In 1931, after Markham died, Daisy bought the remaining stock of the Markham firm (by then called the King Manufacturing Company) and moved all of the tools and dies to the Daisy plant.

Markham arrived in Hollywood when it was a quiet suburban community. He bought a considerable amount of property at Hollywood Boulevard and Vine Street. A decade later the area was a major retail and residential section of Los Angeles.

At the time of his death, Markham owned approximately 100 parcels of land in and around Los Angeles. All of them were leased for 99 years. At Cosmo Street and Hollywood Boulevard he built the Markham Building, for several years one of the largest in Los Angeles.

In 1927, Markham moved to Glendale, Calif., where he cultivated flowers and made his seven-acre estate a sanctuary for birds, which he loved. The odyssey of this complex inventor-entrepreneur-bird watcher came to an end on April 30, 1930. He died in Glendale at the age of 79, leaving the bulk of his large estate to his second wife. Following her death it went to the children of his lawyer.

Phil Markham's two children, by his first wife, tried unsuccessfully to have the will broken. The lawyer who represented the children of Markham's lawyer, during the court case,

was William Gibbs McAdoo, secretary of the treasury under Woodrow Wilson.

Remaining in Plymouth today, as a reminder of the Markhams, is the original air rifle plant still on Main Street, just east of the railroad tracks. It is now owned by former mayor Harold Guenther. The stately white house still stands on Penniman facing the park. It is now occupied by Jack Wilcox, whose father bought it more than 60 years ago.

The bob-tails no longer pull the expensive landau up to the carriage entrance. The petite young lady with the wide picture hat will never again run out to feed the deer or watch the goldfish. The dark-haired man with the drooping mustache and the bat-wing collar will never again look across the park and wonder what is going on in the house on Ann Arbor Trail.

## Unemployment bill reported

The House Education and Labor Committee has reported to the floor of Congress legislation to extend unemployment benefits and provide thousands of public service jobs.

That announcement was made Wednesday by U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor), ranking Republican on the committee, and Rep. Dominick V. Daniels (D-New Jersey), committee chairman. Esch represents the 2nd District which includes Livonia and Plymouth.

**THE TWO-PRONGED** attack on unemployment, approved unanimously by the full committee, could provide up to 500,000 public service jobs over the next six months. It authorizes \$2 billion for the program.

Daniels expects to bring the bill before the House Rules Committee tomorrow (Tuesday) with hopes it will be reported to the House floor for a final vote on Wednesday.

"I believe President Ford will sign the measure and will ask for an immediate supplemental appropriation of up to \$1 billion to begin implementa-

tion of the public employment feature of the bill," predicts Esch.

"We have every intention of seeing this bill enacted into law before the Christmas adjournment," adds Daniels. "It is an effective tool to aid the unemployed throughout the country."

ESCH, who offered an amendment during the committee session to extend unemployment compensation benefits for an additional 13 weeks, noted the provision will extend benefits to many who aren't now eligible.

"This provision will be of great importance in the effort to assist the increasing number of those unemployed, especially in Michigan where our automobile workers have been hard hit by the economic slump," said Esch.

The Esch amendment will extend unemployment benefits for an additional 13 weeks to all those who have exhausted their current benefits and for up to 26 weeks for those not now eligible for unemployment compensation.

a bucket by Kegley. Then again fell behind at the half, 34-28.

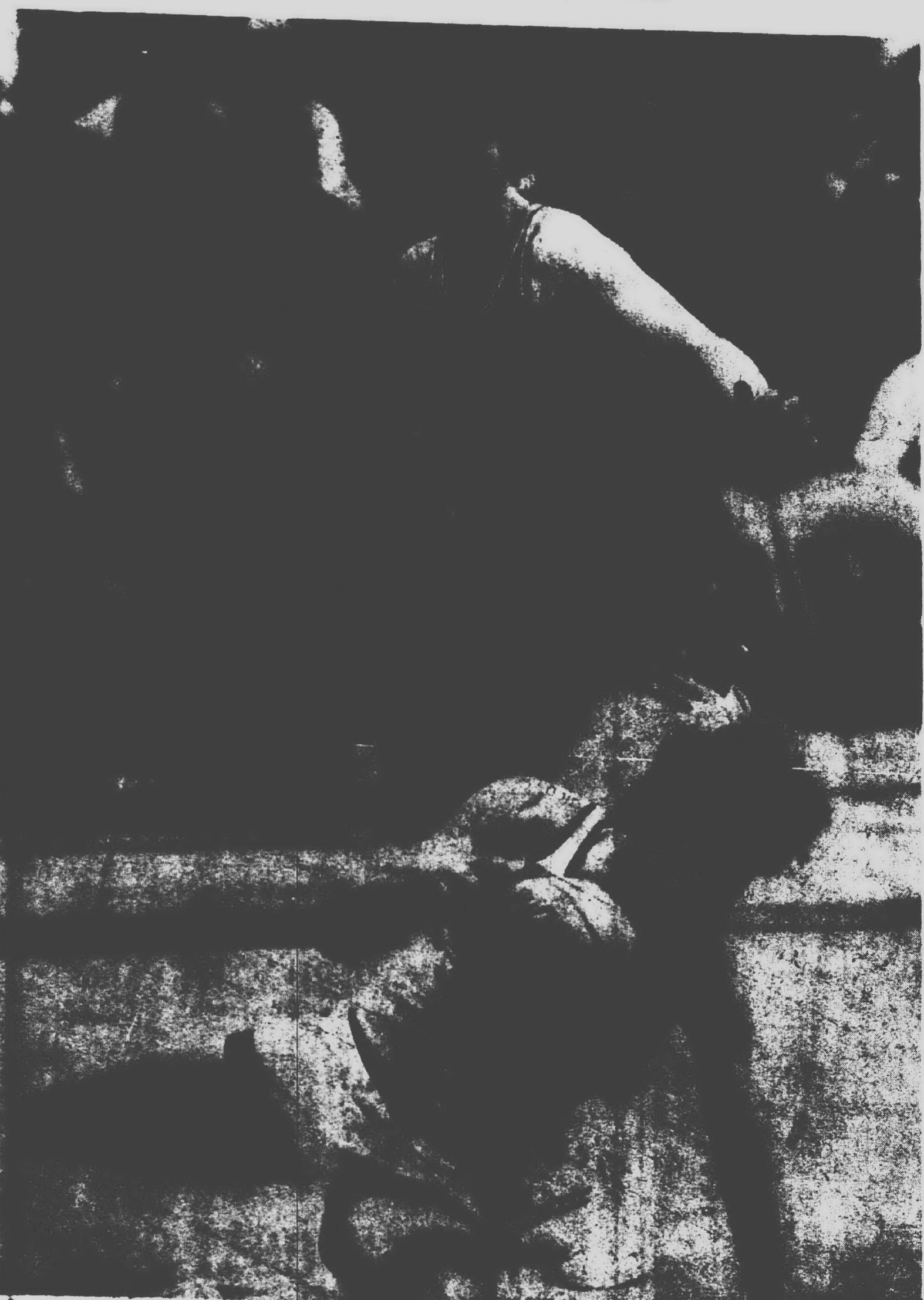
The Bulldogs moved to within one point six times in the third quarter but wound up five points shy at the buzzer.

# Rocks crush Trenton

Even though 12 different men scored and his team ran up a lead of as much as 40 points in routing Trenton 80-49, Plymouth Salem Coach Fred Thomann was elated mainly by the Rocks' defensive play in winning their first Suburban Eight start.

"Get the ball up often enough from good angles and you'll put points on the board, but you win in this game on defense," commented Thomann at game's end.

"Our kids did a great job out there covering 'em man to man, stealing the ball, blocking shots and rebounding. We came ready to play but we'll find out a lot more about this club when we go to Livonia Bentley Tuesday night and take on Belleville at home Saturday."

IF TRENTON had a home court advantage it evaporated with the opening tip-off which Salem's 6-10 Eric Agardy tapped to 6-8 Jim Ellinghausen who fed 6-7 Bill DenHouter streaking for the basket for an easy layup.

From there the Rocks zipped to a 9-0 lead before the Trojans broke the ice with their first free throw and at the end of the quarter Plymouth was on top 19-6. As the barrage continued the Rocks made it 41-14 at halftime and 66-30 after three periods.

Meanwhile, the big front line of Agardy, Ellinghausen and DenHouter,

aided by the fine play of John Maloney, put an almost impenetrable defensive shell around the bucket that allowed Trenton only one field goal in the first quarter and just two in the second stanza.

Even though second and third stringers played at least a third of the game, Plymouth had a 46-30 edge in rebounds, led by Ellinghausen's 14 and eight each from Agardy and Capt. Dan Moore.

The Rocks were credited with nine blocked shots, paced by Ellinghausen's four and Agardy's three, and they made 13 steals.

OFFENSIVELY the Rocks were guilty of only 15 turnovers and shot 45 per cent from the floor on 36 hoops in 80 tries to Trenton's 24 per cent on 15 out of 63. Thomann's starting unit actually shot at a 47 per cent clip on 26 of 55.

Agardy, with a 15-point burst in the third period on six buckets and three charity tosses, was high scorer with 18 points. Ellinghausen popped in 15 and Moore, who led in assists with seven, added 10.

Trenton also had three scorers in double figures: Steve Deller (14), Ron Koshko (13) and Greg Castignola (10), but it was in a futile cause and 19 of the combined 37-point output for this trio came at the free throw line.

Leading 26-12 midway in the second period, the Rocks really went on a scoring binge with Moore, Ellinghausen, Tim Dillon and Brian Wolcott pouring in 15 straight points before Trenton could notch another bucket to make it 41-14 at intermission.

Agardy, DenHouter and Moore whipped in 10 more in a hurry at the start of the second half to a lone goal by the Trojans, making it 51-16 and a 35-point lead.

PLYMOUTH'S margin finally hit 40 points in the opening seconds of the fourth quarter when Wolcott's bucket made it 70-30, and only then did the Trojans find the cords with any consistency as Thomann cleared his 14-man bench.

After going 21-3 last winter, the Rocks now are 2-0 for the new campaign. In defense of their Sub 8 title, they are 1-0 along with Belleville, Allen Park and Dearborn. League losers in Friday's opening round were Bentley, Redford Union, Edsel Ford and Trenton. Including the 15-6 record of 1972-73, Thomann's first season at the Salem helm, the Rocks now are 38-9 under his direction—but no coach considers the past record as important as the next game on the schedule, and for Salem that's Bentley.

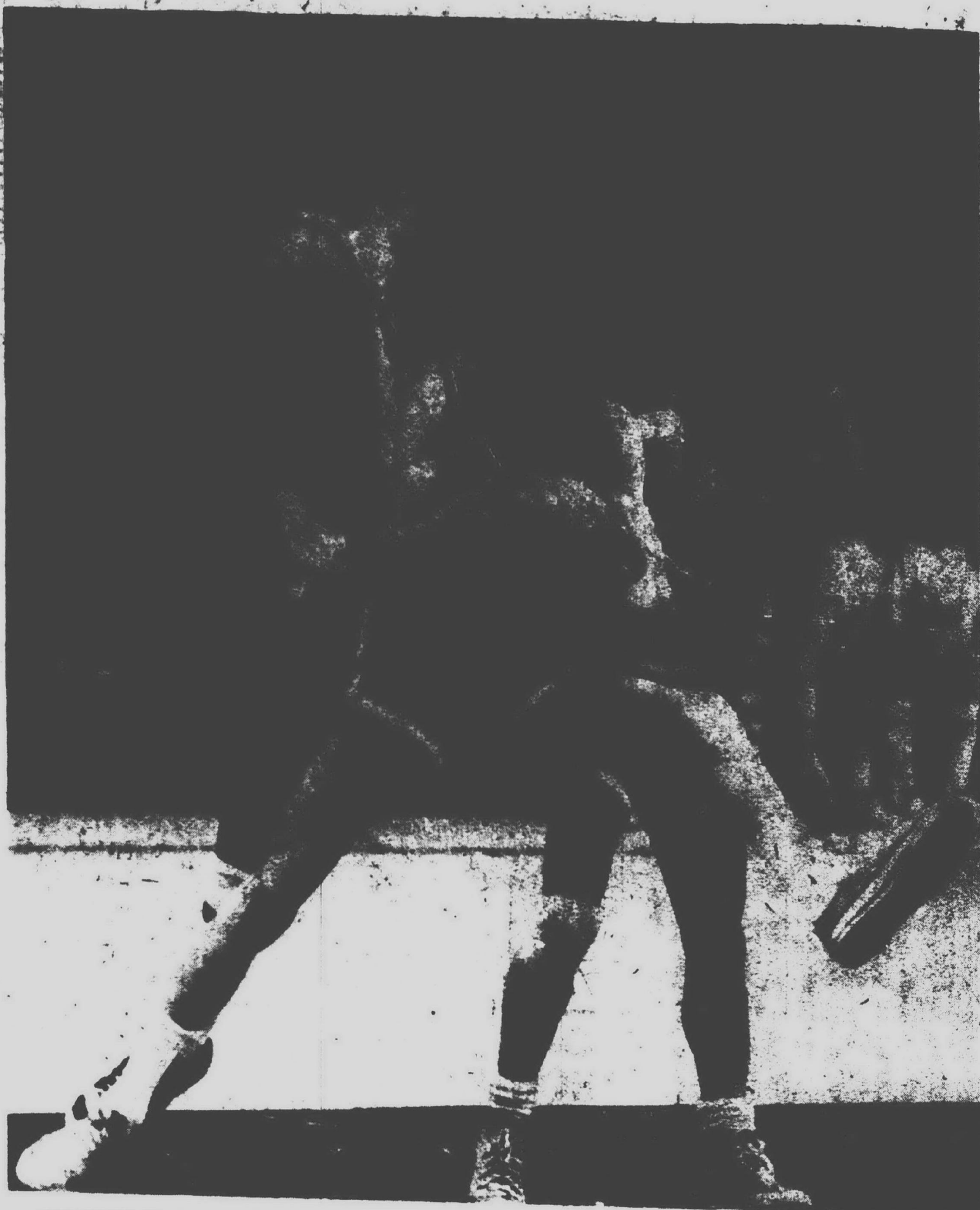

## In The Pocket

Now that the tournament season is with us along the bowling front the age old question of having a dark lane separating the tournament competition from open play in the larger establishments has cropped up again.

Ever since tournaments have been held in the ten pin emporiums, tournament bowlers have claimed the 'open' bowlers bother them when it comes their turn on the approaches.

They charge the "open" bowlers know nothing of etiquette, they slide up to the foul line with you and go to the ball return when you are about to let go of the ball, and all manner of things that distract your attention. Maybe so. But what the tournament bowlers lose sight of is the bowling proprietor contracts with them for use of a specified number of lanes for their tournament. Because of that, the

tournament bowler has no claim on the adjoining lanes.

The proprietor has every right to place customers on his lanes at any time.

That's his business. He hasn't invested thousands of dollars in his establishment just to watch tournament bowlers. He is in business to make a profit. He can't make it if he keeps any of his lanes dark just to satisfy the few who come once a year to compete in a tournament.

Further, there is nothing in the rules of the American Bowling Congress or the Woman's International Bowling Congress that states there must be a dark lane separating tournament and open play.

What's true of tournament play also holds good for league play, too. So, Mr. and Mrs. Bowler, if you want a dark lane separating you from open

play, why not rent it for the duration of your meet? It is just that simple.

Tom McKay, secretary of the Greater Detroit Bowling Association, is moving up the ladder in the tenpin world.

He has been named a director of the American Bowling Congress to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Les Townsend. The ABC made the appointment, effective Dec. 1.

The importance of a single pin was proven again this week in the Wonderland Classic where one stick prevented Hugh Humpert from registering one of the highest triplicates of all time.

He opened with a 246 and repeated that count in the second game, but could do no better than 245 in the final for a 737 series.

The record triplicate for the metropolitan Detroit area was established by the late Thern Gibson when he rolled identical games of 268.

Humpert's big count enabled his Westland team to come through with a 3260 series.

Only a few lanes away, George Stefan linked games of 223, 257 and 229 for a 709. This enabled his Viscount team to tally the high series of the night with a 3275.

Cora Fiebig, who will be remembered for gathering a team of "sixth" members that won the state tournament last spring, is making a strong bid to become the women's top average bowler of the year.

In the latest figures released she is averaging 129.31 in the Bowlerettes circuit, and 197.27 in the Ladies Major League for a mean average of 193.29.

At her present pace she is leading Bonnie Barnes, her closest rival, by five pins.

The pins went flying in the Wednesday Ladies League in Livonia Lanes. Dorothy Thomas, a 165-average bowler, fashioned a 267 game in a 577 series and Eleanor Blovaite, with a 160 average, posted a 212 finishing game after counts of 168 and 175 for a 555 series.
