## Growth brings drop in phone rates

Some Plymouth, Canton and Westland residents will start the new year with a pleasant surprise.

While prices of most goods and services are rising, telephone rates for many residents will decrease 55 cents to \$2.50 a month, beginning in mid-January, because of a Michigan Bell Telephone redistricting move, recently approved by the Public Service Commission.

Although the move will cost Michigan Bell \$47,660 in annual revenue, the company is implementing the plan

"because of growth in the area," according to press relations manager Phil Jones.

"It's really a matter of improving service," Jones explained. "As the area continues to grow, the revenue base will grow as well."

The plan will affect some residents of Plymouth, Canton and Salem townships and some residents of Westland, who have received "suburban zone charges," fees for living away from population centers, on their telephone bills.

The redistricting plan will eliminate

those extra charges by placing residents in the base rate areas of population centers.

Residents of the northwestern chunk of Canton Township, who live between Joy and Cherry Hill and Canton Center Road and the township line, and residents of Plymouth Township, who live between Joy and North Territorial and between an extended line of Canton Center Road and about one-half mile west of Beck, will receive a rate decrease because of placement in the Plymouth base rate area.

Westland residents who live between Newburgh and Hannan and between Joy and Cherry Hill will receive the same rate decreases.

Those residents will pay 85 cents less a month for one-party lines and 55 cents less for two-party lines.

Michigan Bell is adding those areas to the base rate area because of new subdivisions, apartment complexes and shopping centers.

Plymouth Township residents who live between Ridge and Napier and between North Territorial and Five Mile

will receive a rate decrease of 80 cents to \$2.50 a month, as will residents of a Canton Township subdivision, located between Napier and Ridge and Joy and Warren.

Residents with one-party lines, who live within the previously zoned circle of "rural zone one," will receive a rate decrease of 80 cents a month, while residents with two-party lines will receive a rate decrease of 85 cents a month.

Those residents who live within the previously zoned circle of "rural zone

two," which is farther from Detroit will receive a rate decrease of \$2.50 a month with one-party lines and a decrease of \$1.70 a month with two-party lines.

The areas include new subdivisions and a mobile home park.

In addition, the redistricting plan will push out the concentric circles of rural zoned areas that buffer Detroit's western suburbs and lower rates from 85 cents to \$5.05 a month.

The redistricting plan will affect 4,890 homes in all.

## Accidents injure 7

CANTON TOWNSHIP—Two separate accidents at the Canton Center Road-Cherry Hill intersection sent seven persons to Wayne County General Hospital.

Three persons were injured Monday at 11:30 a.m. when, according to a Wayne County Sheriff Dept. report, a car driven by Lawrence Roy Workman, 43, of Wayne, "ran the stop sign on Cherry Hill," into the path of a car driven by Lavern Williams, 47, of Detroit. Her car then veered off Canton Center Road and slammed into a telephone pole.

Both drivers were taken to the hospital as was Workman's passenger, Bertha Workman, 73, of Dearborn.

On Tuesday, at 2:50 p.m. four persons were injured in an accident involving three cars.

A sheriff report states a car driven by Sherry Ann Bryant, 16, of 940 Douglas, Garden City, "failed to yield the right of way" while heading west on Cherry Hill. Her car was struck by another car driven by Sam Henry Music, 34, of 433 John Hix, Westland.

Miss Bryant's car was pushed into a third vehicle, driven by Floyd A. Dis-

brown Jr., 22, of 33952 Fountain Blvd., Westland, who ended up near the telephone pole being repaired from the accident the previous day.

Music and his passenger, Wilma Jarvis, 36, of Ypsilanti, were taken to Wayne County General Hospital.

Miss Bryant and her passenger, Mary Bryant, 52, of the Garden City address, were also hospitalized. Dis-brown did not require hospitalization, according to the sheriff.

Both accidents are still under investigation.

## Leave policy questioned

PLYMOUTH—The Plymouth school board and the Plymouth Educational Association will attempt to iron out two grievances Jan. 13, typing students at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park soon will pound on new electric typewriters, and school board meeting audiences will hear board proceedings better.

Those were items on which the school board unanimously acted last week.

The board set Jan. 13 as the hearing date for two PEA grievances. Both grievances, according to School Supt. John Hoben, concern a contract stipulation requiring 90 days of teaching time per semester.

One teacher, Hoben said, wants to apply a 30-day maternity leave to the required time, and another, who was hired late in the year, wants to apply the teaching time he missed at the beginning of the semester.

The board approved the purchase of 34 IBM electric typewriters for the Centennial Educational Park through state vocational educational added cost funds.

Funds for the typewriters, costing

\$630 each, will come from the district's general fund. The state which approved the purchase, will later reimburse the district, according to Plymouth School Board President E. J. McClendon.

The new typewriters will replace 34 other IBM electric typewriters, now nine years old, McClendon said.

In other action, the board agreed to purchase a sound system from Stereoland for \$842.

The system will be installed in the Plymouth Canton High School Little Theater where school board meetings are usually held and will enable audiences to hear proceedings at school board meetings better.

## Starkweather gets fire escape

PLYMOUTH—A fire escape at Starkweather Elementary School soon will provide an emergency exit to pupils on the second floor.

The Plymouth School Board has awarded a contract for the fire escape to the low bidder, Ossie's Welding, Inc., for \$7,869.

The escape will provide an emergency exit in case the stairwells are blocked by fire, according to board

president E. J. McClendon.

Starkweather is the only school in the district, he said, in which elementary school pupils attend classes on the second floor.

The escape will be built outside an art and music classroom. Chairs and tables in the classroom will be bolted to the floor to provide a pathway to the exit.

## Mulligan returns as Plymouth postmaster

PLYMOUTH—After five months off the job, Plymouth Postmaster Arthur Mulligan returned to his desk last Thursday, and while Mulligan is happy to have his job back, some of his employees are less than pleased with his return.

Mulligan resigned his position with the Postal Service in May of this year, with an effective date of July 30. Just prior to that time, he attempted to withdraw his resignation, was unsuccessful and appealed the decision to the Civil Service Commission.

Mulligan's appeal was upheld and he returned to work with full back-pay.

EMPLOYEES, WHO asked that their names be withheld, noted that while Mulligan served in Plymouth, morale

was low, but during his five-month absence things improved. "We've had problems with Mulligan in the past, but I hope he will change now that he's back," noted one employee.

The same employee said that interim Officer in Charge Kenneth Harris had been very "reasonable" and "fair" to work with, noting Harris had maintained an "open door policy" for the employees.

"He (Mulligan) seemed to be concerned with picky things and not whether a person was handling his job right," noted another employee.

WHEN ASKED about alleged morale problems, Mulligan said things were not that bad prior to his leaving in July. "I felt I was getting along with people here, and I felt I could work with these people. Some I got along with and some I didn't. There are some people who you can never get along with."

Mulligan said he first submitted his resignation because he felt he was not getting any cooperation from the district office in Detroit. He said he later decided that he would start over again and try to work with it, but his initial attempt at withdrawing his resignation was unsuccessful.

The postmaster and former teacher added that rumors that he wanted to

return to teaching were in error. "At no time did I consider going back to teaching."

NOW THAT HE is back on the job, Mulligan noted some changes that he had tried to make prior to his leaving in July had been accomplished. Several offices were enlarged, and others were built to add privacy for some supervisors and foremen who had desk work to do.

Mulligan added that the building will be completely painted inside and flooring replaced in part of the building.

Looking to the future, Mulligan said plans are currently under way to build another post office "within the next three years."

Citing the expansion taking place in Canton Township, a majority of which is served from Plymouth, Mulligan said that plans were under way to construct a new building "within the next three years."

"We will need at least 10 acres for the facility, to allow for adequate parking for employees and patrons. I'd like to see the new post office built in downtown Plymouth, but I don't think there is any site big enough," he said.

According to Mulligan, the next logical step might be to look for a site in Canton.

# French students planning tour of Quebec

For the past few years, John Hopkins, Plymouth Salem High School French teacher, has been performing what to other teachers must seem like a small miracle.

Since 1970, he has taken 25-70 students on a week's trip to either Quebec of France. Quebec was chosen for the next trip, March 22-28, because rising costs in France make the cost almost prohibitive.

Quebec is the next thing to home to Hopkins, who with his wife spends each summer there and has recently bought property on an island not far from Montreal. Sometime in the future, the Hopkinses plan to establish a permanent home on their picturesque island whose only transportation, aside from foot, is horse drawn carriage.

THE STUDENTS WHO have already signed up for the seven day trip next March have caught the excitement of anticipation of French-speaking Canadian province. They will leave by jet from Windsor, land in Quebec City the same morning, spend

three days in that city and the province, and then take the Canadian National Railroad to Montreal.

Since Hopkins knows the cities and the area so well, he makes basic transportation plans, lists the things he wants to be sure to see, and plays the rest by ear.

He figures the cost per student at between \$200 and \$250, depending on accommodations and the typical and very good restaurants which will give the best group rates. Hopkins is checking with the group to see if they would prefer hotel or youth hostel accommodations. Hostels, if available, would be less expensive and give local students a chance to meet others from a variety of places.

Experiences already on the "must" list are a bus tour of Montreal, a carriage ride through Old Quebec, the changing of the guard at the Citadel, Notre Dame des Victoires Church dating from 1688, a visit to a maple sugar bush in rural Quebec, St. Anne de Beaupre shrine, along with options for many other sights.

These include Laval University campus, Ursuline monastery, Island of Orleans, an evening boat trip on the St. Olympics and many more sights in Montreal.

HOPKINS SAYS, "We'll try to cram in as much as we possibly can."

But even with many things on the itinerary, Hopkins sees that his students have time to move about the cities by themselves, using their French, finding things that are particularly interesting to them.

And in all the trips, the students have done beautifully in making decisions, obeying the rules which they help to establish, and not getting lost.

Hopkins, who consults with his students on all the details, says, "We've just never had any problems. As far as the kids are concerned, they never give me any trouble."

He attributes this in part to the fact that he doesn't arbitrarily place restrictions on them. They agree together ahead of time what their responsibilities are. Hopkins has never been disappointed.

"I tell them they should be back at a reasonable time. They ask what's reasonable, and we decide together."

Deadline for signing up for the Quebec trip is Jan. 31. Five years ago when Hopkins took his first trip he established a precedent as the first group from the high school ever to go to a foreign country. Others have followed, but chances are, none has been more successful.

## Her horses keep her busy

PLYMOUTH—Fifteen-year-old Carol Terry, a sophomore at Plymouth Canton High School, rushes home from school each day to perform her chores.

Dashing into a barn behind her home at 7025 Napier, Miss Terry empties water-filled bottles in a trough, re-arranges piles of hay and begins grooming her ponies and horse.

"It takes up most of your time," Miss Terry confessed. "But if you like it, it doesn't seem like that much work. Brushing the horses, keeping the stalls clean and riding take up most of the time."

Miss Terry received her first horse when she was nine. She now owns one horse and four ponies, one of which she raised from a foal. Two other ponies, which she had raised, were sold.

Miss Terry raises horses for the challenge.

"Right from the minute they're born, you have to start working on them," Miss Terry said, as she gave one brown pony a loving pat. You

handle them and teach them to turn on the lead. When they get old enough, you use the lunge line. That teaches them voice command. It helps them to be more responsive to you. Hopefully, when you get on them, they won't be afraid or get excited."

Since June, Miss Terry has paid for the cost of the horse's upkeep. To offset the cost of hay, feed and medical bills, which climb over \$20 per horse each month, one stall of the Terrys' barn is rented to owners of a foal. Miss Terry cares for the boarded horse.

Another pony is "loaned" to 12-year-old Chris Housden, whom Miss Terry met through the Plymouth Town and Country 4-H Club. Miss Housden cares for the pony in the Terrys' barn and pays for its feed. In return, she enters the pony as her own in local fairs.

A similar arrangement was established with another girl, until she acquired her own horse, Miss Terry said.

"I don't take everyone in off the street," she said. "The kid has to be fairly interested in doing it."

Neither does Miss Terry allow everyone to ride her horses.

"I don't let too many people ride them, because there are certain ways the horses are trained," she explained. "It's unfair to the horse to have too many people ride and confuse him. There's training involved every time you go out to ride."

To supplement her horse-raising hobby, Miss Terry trains some of the dogs her parents breed at obedience classes offered by the Plymouth Paw Prints Club.

But she spends a great deal of her time astride a horse.

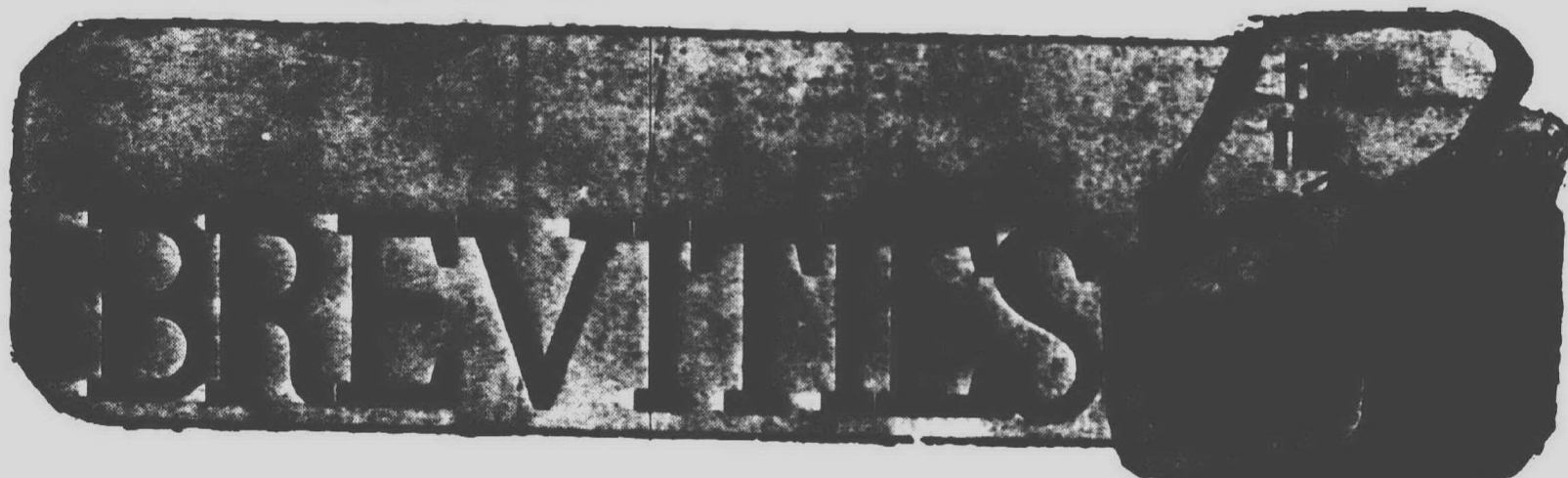
"In winter, a lot of people don't ride their horses," she said. "The horses can survive with a little bit of exercise, but I love riding so much, my horses get a lot of exercise."

With that, Miss Terry hopped astride one pony and galloped across the snow-covered field.

# Many shocked by 1907 wreck

On July 20, 1907, shortly after 9 a.m., an eastbound Pere Marquette train, filled with passengers from Ionia, hurtled around a sharp curve and into a steep embankment four miles west of Plymouth.

At the same moment, a six-car freight train, heading west, entered the cut on the same track. They met head-on, creating one of the major railroad wrecks in the history of the United States.

The events leading to the tragedy began early on a Saturday morning. Conductor Hamilton, in charge of the freight, received orders to take his train on the main line toward Salem. Some of the cars contained gravel to be dumped enroute.

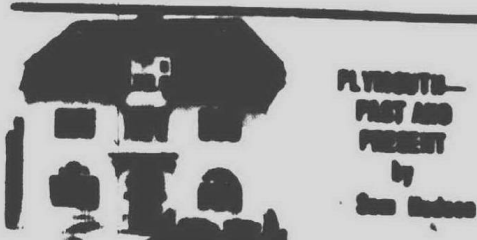
Hamilton read the orders. He handed them to the rest of his crew to read. Engineer Wilson Rogers read the orders and climbed into the cab.

**THIS IS WHAT** happened from then on!

8:40 a.m. The freight train pulled out of the Plymouth yards and headed for Rathbun's Crossing.

9:05 a.m. Two carloads of gravel were dumped just east of the crossing. The train proceeded toward Salem.

9:10 a.m. A special excursion train, consisting of 10 passenger coaches and a baggage car, pulled out of Salem and headed toward Plymouth. The crew included conductor E.J. Pixley, engineer Alvard, fireman Charles Knowles and brakeman Ed Cowan. The train had originated at Ionia, where the Pere Marquette Railroad had a large car repair shop. Some 800

railroad employees, their families and friends, aboard the train, were headed for Detroit, where a boat had been chartered to take them to Belle Isle for their annual picnic.

9:12 a.m. Nine-year-old Clyde Smith and his father Edward were hoeing potatoes on the farm they rented from Will Thayer, on Six Mile about three-fourths of a mile north of the railroad tracks. They saw the trains approach Van Side cut from opposite directions. The cut is about a quarter mile east of the Napier Road crossing where Robert Willoughby was injured by a train a few years ago. The Smiths stood transfixed as the trains rushed toward each other.

**AT THAT MOMENT**, a recent graduate of the eighth grade in Ionia, Ethel Connor (later Mrs. Robert Joliffe of Plymouth) was riding backward in the front seat of a coach next to the smoker. Ethel and two companions carried basket lunches for the picnic. Thoughts of the picnic were suddenly shattered by the shrill blast of whistles, the grinding of wheels, and a deafening crash as the two locomotives smashed into each other.

The wooden coaches collapsed like matchwood, huge splinters shooting out in all directions. The hiss of escaping steam drowned out the screams of passengers.

Ethel, knocked unconscious, recovered quickly. Her back hurt, but she was able to move. Steam was filling the coach. Ethel and her two companions pushed a window open. The coach they were in had telescoped on top of the smoker. The girls jumped to the roof of the smoker and jumped to the ground.

By this time, Clyde Smith and his father had arrived at the 20-foot embankment. It was a jumbled mass of passenger and freight cars. The six leading coaches were piled one on top of another. People were crawling out of doors and windows. The Smiths, Jim Spencer, and others from nearby farmhouses, began to pull the injured from the wreckage. One dying man begged to be shot.

Uninjured passengers, who had recovered from the initial shock, improvised coach doors as stretchers and began to move the dead and injured.

Approx. 9:30 a.m. Someone phoned Plymouth, asking that all physicians be dispatched to the scene. Doctors Patterson, Kimble, Kenyon and Knight, with several women to assist, rushed to the Plymouth depot where a special train took them to the wreck-age.

By the time the doctors arrived, 28 of the dead had been lined up with their heads along the south fence. Most of those killed had been in the smoker which was next to the locomotive. Some of the injured were taken

to nearby farm houses, including that of James Boyle, a quarter-mile north of the wreck. Some were cared for in the rear coaches of the train. The Plymouth doctors went about, administering emergency treatment.

11:30 a.m. A special train, carrying doctors, nurses and medical equipment pulled out of Fort Street station in Detroit. Aboard the train was Iva Bentley, whose people owned a restaurant in Plymouth.

**News:** Fourteen-year old Ezra Rot-nour, of Plymouth, jumped on his bicycle and pedaled to the wreck. He parted his bike near a cemetery and clambered down the embankment. When he reached the spot where the two locomotives were still locked in deadly embrace, Ezra saw a brass plate bearing the number of one of the locomotives. He thought it would make a good souvenir to put on his bike. It was too heavy to carry so Ezra gave up the effort.

Seventeen-year old Walter Ebert, who worked at the Marikham air rifle factory, left the plant at noon and walked to the wreck. Ebert was one of many in Plymouth who never returned to work that day. When only six Marikham employees showed up after lunch, Superintendent Ernie Roe closed the plant and followed his men to the Van Side cut.

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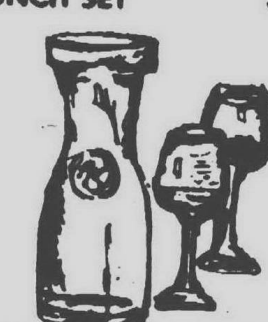
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# State inauguration to be frugal this year

The New Year's Day inaugural of Gov. William G. Milliken will be less pomp than in other years because of the state of the economy.

The Jan. 1 inaugural — mandated by the Michigan Constitution — will sacrifice frills for frugality, according to officials from the governor's office.

FOR INSTANCE, a decision has been made to cancel the jet flyover which traditionally opens the ceremonies on the front steps of the Capitol in Lansing.

Cancellation of the four-plane flight will yield savings in money and energy. For jet fuel alone, the flight from Selfridge Air National Guard Base near Mt. Clemens to Lansing and return would have cost about \$1,400.

The F-100 fighter planes in the formation would have used up more than 2,300 gallons of fuel, basically kerosene, which costs the Guard about 60 cents a gallon. Overtime pay for pilots and ground crews would have cost about \$1,000.

The major cost of the inaugural will be construction of a wooden platform to seat inaugurees and honored guests.

Some thought had been given to building a larger platform because of the "additional" inaugurees, whom in-

clude six new judges being added to the State Court of Appeals. But it was decided to make-do with the platform used in the last inaugural in 1971.

Despite the general downhold on costs, however, most traditional elements will be maintained.

THE PROGRAM, to begin at 10 a.m., will include the governor's inaugural address which will feature a Michigan heritage theme. A state poet will recite a special inaugural poem.

A public reception will be from 3-5 p.m. in the governor's office on the second floor of the Capitol. Milliken and wife Helen will be hosts.

Several musical groups will entertain in the rotunda of the Capitol during the reception. Another concert, featuring performers from Interlochen Academy and Detroit Symphony Orchestra, will perform in the House chambers. There is no charge to the public for any of the official inaugural activities.

MICHIGAN Democrats and Republicans are planning their own inaugural day activities, which are designed to both salute the inaugurees and help pay off election campaign debts.

Democrats, who swept 10 of 12 statewide partisan posts in November, will host a luncheon. Republicans will hold

a dinner and inaugural ball to honor the governor.

Inaugural addresses will also be made by Attorney General Frank J. Kelley and Secretary of State Richard H. Austin.

Other top officials to be sworn in include: James J. Damman of Troy, lieutenant governor; Thomas M. Kavanagh and Fitzgerald, justices of the State Supreme Court; Roger Tilles of Swartz Creek and Barbara Roberts of Lansing to the State Board of Education.

## House passes Esch's bill to aid jobless

The House of Representatives has passed a bill described by U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor) as the most far reaching attack on Michigan's jobless rate since the depression.

Esch, whose 2nd District includes Livonia and Plymouth, said the estimated \$3.2 billion package would provide millions of dollars next year for public service jobs. It also extended unemployment benefits in Michigan, hard hit by auto industry layoffs.

"AS A CHIEF architect of these proposals," says Esch, "I've had assurances from the White House that President Ford is committed to signing the legislation into law before the end of this year."

Esch is ranking Republican on the House Select Labor Committee.

If approved by the Senate and fully funded by Congress, he says, the authorizing legislation would pump an estimated \$250 million into Michigan during 1975 in jobless benefits and money for public service employment.

"The House passed what I would consider the most significant and far reaching unemployment legislation since the depression years," said Esch.

"Besides providing thousands of public employment jobs in Michigan it will extend jobless benefits to millions of workers across the nation who aren't currently eligible for unemployment compensation."

If fully funded by Congress, the legislation would also provide an additional \$1.8 billion in 1976 for unemployment compensation of which Esch said "a fair percentage would be directed into Michigan."

ON THIS New Year morning, marketers were bidding outlandish prices for my charismatic crimson-colored fruit as we were catalogued on the tailgate of a grower's truck ready to be dumped for whomever would pay the ridiculously high price, even though I'm worth twice fold of any current rating system.

### HABBIT ROUGE CHEESECAKE FOR TORTE

- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/4 lb. butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 lb. cream cheese
- 1/2 lb. bakers cheese
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 qt. whipped cream (stiff)
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 teaspoon cornstarch
- 5 eggs separated
- 1 tsp. plain gelatin dissolve in cold water (quickly)
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- Juice of 1 lemon strained
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 1/2 cup ground or finely chopped almonds

### METHOD

Scald milk. Whip egg yolks and sugar in an electric mixer to a frothy consistency. Add flour and cornstarch to melted butter. Save one-quarter for

crust. Whip both cheeses until fluffy.

Add sour cream and fold to the cheese mixture. Mix graham crackers, almonds, two tablespoons sugar and the remainder of melted butter. Add cinnamon.

Add milk to the whipped eggs and fold gently with a wooden spoon or a rubber spatula set in a water bath that has been simmering. Cook, stirring constantly until the frothy custard kind of coats the stirring instrument.

Do not overcook unless scrambled

are desired. Fold in gelatin. Cool. Boil one cup water. Add the roux flour, cornstarch and butter with a French whisk and whip until smooth. Add the cheeses and flavorings, lemon and vanilla.

WHIP THE EGG whites until frothy with a pinch of cream of tartar. This keeps the whites together. A pinch of sugar may be added. Add the egg white mixture to the warm cheese panade (always add the light stuff to the heavy stuff.)

When mixture has cooled slightly (room temperature) fold in the fresh whipped cream. Now blend with a French whisk the egg yolk mixture. If mixture has become congealed in the interim just whip to a froth.

More vanilla or some rum may be added to your taste. If mixture is too stiff to fluff out onto the crumb-lined nine-inch cake tins, then just add some hot water while folding.

CRUST: Pat crumbs on bottom. Only bake four minutes. Cool. Freeze overnight or until ready for torte.

### HABBIT ROUGE TORTE

- 1 yellow nine-inch yellow cake layer split through to make two separate layers
- 1 quart and 1 pint of whipping cream
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/4 cup grenadine
- Whip until stiff. Set in cooler.

Two quarts fresh strawberries hulled with the exception of 12 or so to decorate with, depending on their size. Slice the remainder thinly. Wash the strawberries with the hulls on. This will secure all the flavor of the berry.

To assemble the torte, follow these simple steps: Remove frozen cheesecake and set on a nine-inch flat plate or your cake stand, crumb side down.

Spread about one quarter thick of whipped cream, then some strawberries (sliced). Add some more whipped cream. Then add layer cake, whipped cream, strawberries and more cream. Add the remaining layer and press gently to flatten top. Check and make sure sides are uniform.

Frost cake with stainless pastry spatula, keeping a round form. Cut the large berries. Set aside for decorating in half and line around the top of the torte with the hulls slightly outside, over-hanging the side of the torte side by side as closely as possible.

THIS WILL eliminate any irregularities in the circumference. Fill the remainder of whipped cream in a pastry bag with a No. 5 star tube (purchased at a pastry shop supply house) and try your hand at making a capital "C" all around the center of the top.

Rules for pressing cream through a pastry: After bag is filled to half, twist, squeeze with your palm and guide with your opposite index finger on the side of the star tube. Hold elbow with bag in hand as close to your side as possible. This will steady your hand as she goes.

Make a complete circle with your pastry bag on a 75-degree angle. Overlap each circle slightly as you make a complete circle of circles. Do the same thing on the base of the cake. Decorate with strawberry wedges. Then sprinkle with toasted almonds chopped finely in sugar on the sides. Exquisite with asti spumanti.

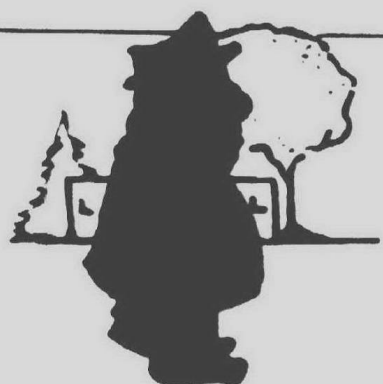

## Legend of bells

When the hands meet at the top of the clock Tuesday night and we reach midnight, The Stroller will open the back door and race for the old farm bell to carry out the tradition of "ringing out the old and ringing in the new" to start the New Year celebration.

He's been doing this for years. While others may be raising their glasses in toast or join millions in front of TV sets to await Guy Lombardo and his orchestra swinging into "Auld Lang Syne" with the "Sweetest Music This Side of Heaven," The Stroller will be ringing the treasured old bell that has weathered the summer suns and winter winds for more than a century. It will be his part in welcoming the new years.

How did this tradition start? THE STROLLER doesn't know exactly, except that ringing of bells has played a prominent part in celebrations and lifestyles since his childhood.

As a youngster it was the school bell that beckoned him to class each morning in the Dutch country. We used to have a bell ringing at 8:30 a.m. This was first call. Then the bell rang at five minute intervals until 8:45.

Many a morning there was a race to beat the third bell and escape the penalty for being late.

It was the same on Sunday morning, except that it was another bell with a different tone. It was the bell in the belfry of the little white church on the hill sounding the call to worship.

### Stroller told putz hasn't disappeared

I was delighted to read W. W. Edgar's "Stroller" column about the Moravian putz as I was born and raised as a Moravian and am still a member of my home church in Wisconsin.

The putz has not disappeared-not where there are still Moravians!

My home church, Watertown, Wis., has a very elaborate basement display just as you described it—lights, music and usually a narrator. When I was a child, an aunt and uncle had a large putz under their tree also for my four cousins, and I always enjoyed seeing theirs. I was an only child and did not have a putz.

HOWEVER, I AM sure you also know that no Moravian home would be without a Moravian star in the window! This tradition I have carried, and if you drive past my home you will see a star shining brightly in my front window every night.

They really are something to put together, and I am so proud of myself that when I had to buy a new one I managed to put it together myself.

I can remember riding around town at Christmas to see the home decorations and always thrilled to spot a home with a Moravian star in the window. Non-Moravians also purchased them, and somehow I never thought it was right as it is truly a Moravian custom.

YOU PROBABLY are also familiar with the candlelight Christmas Eve services—truly a beautiful and moving experience.

When I was young, it was quite an event when you reached the age old enough to be a "diener" and serve the candles. At first they were served from special made candle trays and were brought into the church already lit. It was a beautiful sight.

Now (at least in my home church) a candle is lit for the first person in the pew, and he passes it down until every person in every pew has a candle. Yes, it is somewhat dangerous but there never has been an accident as many people (ushers, etc.) are appointed to stand guard. When all the candles are distributed, the traditional hymn "Morning Star" is sung.

There is a Moravian church on Hively in Westland and they observe the usual Christmas Eve candle light service.

Thank you for bringing back lovely memories and for telling the Observer & Eccentric readers about a Moravian custom. So few people know about the Moravians, and I seem to have spent a life time explaining what a Moravian stands for!

It was this church bell that sounded the news that the armistice was signed Nov. 11, 1918, to end World War I. At the evening service the previous Sunday, the minister told the congregation that there was hope the armistice would be signed and that he hoped he could ring the bell to spread the news.

In the wee hours of Monday morning, we were awakened with the sound of the church bell. The war was over, and it was time to celebrate. This signal from the old church bell set off one of the greatest celebrations the Lehigh Valley ever knew.

AS YOUNGSTERS we were taught the significance of bell ringing.

The Stroller remembers being taken to Independence Hall in Philadelphia each July Fourth by his aunt Fannie to see the famed Liberty Bell. As we entered the room that housed the bell, she'd always lean over and whisper:

"Put your hand on the bell, bow your head, and say a prayer for our country!"

It was always a solemn moment, and it is ingrained in The Stroller's memory. Even today, when he visits the old home areas he takes a stroll

down the main street and pays a visit to the old church where the Liberty Bell was hidden during the war.

Before the areas were heavily settled, each farmhouse boasted a bell. It was used to call the farm hands to meals and to ring at various celebrations during the year.

On cold, winter nights, ringing these bells was sweet music as the sounds rent the air across the countryside, heralding the arrival of the new year.

So it was only natural when The Stroller had a home built out here he would have an old fashioned country bell. He returned to the old Dutch farm country and found one that, legend had it, was rung for at least a half century. That was 36 years ago.

SINCE it was placed in the back yard landscaping, it has played a prominent part in New Year's celebrations. This year will be no different as the neighbors and friends are invited to join in carrying out the old tradition.

So, by any chance, if you want to find The Stroller on New Year's Eve, there's only one place he'll be—in the yard ringing the old farm bell to usher in the young 1975.

### Mail's been sidetracked

Some strange things are happening in the U.S. Postal Service, as anyone who has paid a bill or sent us a news article well knows.

We analyzed a batch of mail received the day before Christmas and found that two-thirds of it arrived here in our main office at 36251 Schoolcraft, Livonia, within a few days after you mailed it.

But a whopping one-third took 10 to 12 days to deliver, even though the senders lived in nearby towns. Here's a tally of 45 pieces of mail received here on Dec. 24:

Postmarked Dec. 12—items from Pontiac and Grosse Pointe Shores.

Postmarked Dec. 13—items from northwest Detroit, Southfield and Farmington.

Postmarked Dec. 14—items from Plymouth, West Bloomfield, northwest Detroit, Redford Township, Livonia, Inkster, Southfield, Lathrup Village and Farmington Hills.

Postmarked Dec. 15—items from Garden City, Redford Township and Plymouth.

IN OTHER WORDS, while two-thirds of the mail was delivered normally, one-third was unexplainably sidetracked for nine to 12 days. A terrific proportion just sat around someplace for the better part of two weeks.

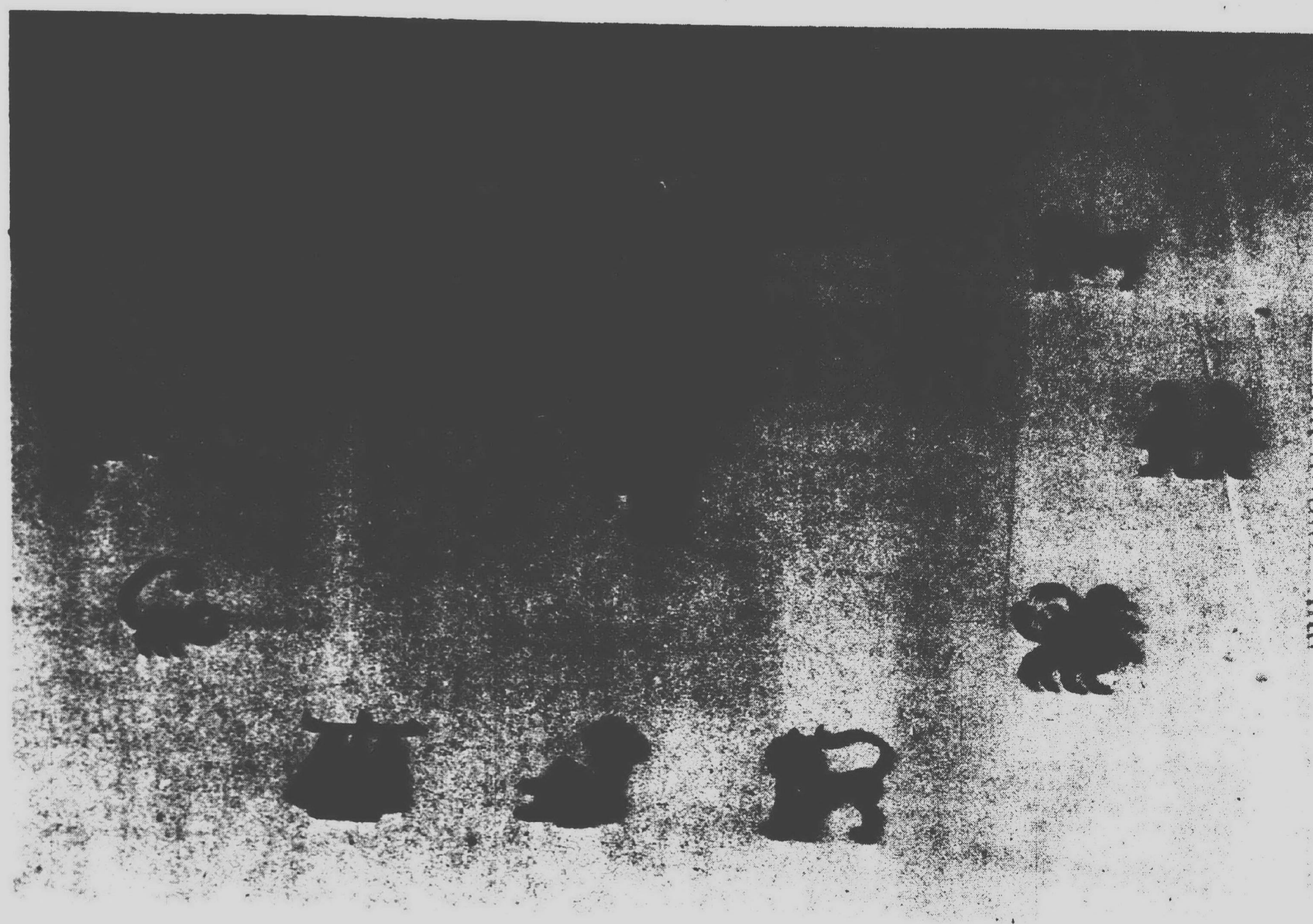

## New Year is welcomed by a Plymouth collection

A collection of clocks of the past will usher in 1975 with assorted chimes and dongs in the William Bake home in Plymouth.

"My interest is in antiques in general rather than specifically clocks," who works for General Motors and has lived in Plymouth most of his life.

He counts his noteworthy time pieces at 14—"a small collection compared to many"—but numbered among them are some interesting examples of clockworks and cabinetry art.

Bake's favorite probably is the English clock that rests on his living room mantelpiece.

"I bought it in London and it is representative of those made about 1800," he said. "It's unusual in mantle clocks because it has installed both Wittington bells and Westminster chimes."

Also distinctive in this clock is the bronze ornamentation on the outside of the case and gold leaf on the area surrounding the dial behind the glass.

ANOTHER UNUSUAL timepiece is a Wedgewood clock that Bake acquired in an auction sale in Lockport, N.Y. several years ago.

It dates from about 1900, Bake said, and the Wedgewood blue English case makes it rare. The works are American.

An eight-day weight clock with a rosewood case is another example of the unusual in the world of timepieces.

This one, bought by Bake at an auction, in Indiana 25 years ago, comes from Plymouth Hollow, Conn., and was made about 1830. Below its face is a hand-painted design.

"Its works of the weight variety are earlier than the spring type of clock works. Weight clocks are more accurate and less troublesome in terms of breaking and repairing."

This clock needed a lot of restoration, its owner said. "Everything was there, but it was in pretty bad shape," he added. Bake said he does quite a bit of repair and refinishing work on the clock cases and can do some of the simple mechanical work.

A FAMILY HEIRLOOM is a calendar clock that records not only the time of day but also the day of the week and the date.

"It dates from 1850 and was owned by Col. Miles Saunderv, who fought with the Union Army in the Civil War and is an ancestor of mine on my father's side."

Many calendar clocks were made, he added, but not too many of the mantle variety like his. This one also is distinctive because of its wood carving.

Calendar clocks are geared to 31-day months, he said. For shorter months there's a trip mechanism to adjust manually.

A grandfather clock stands in the corner of the Bakes' living room. It's not particularly old, but has great sentimental value because it belonged to Bake's parents, William and Jessie Bake, longtime residents of Plymouth.

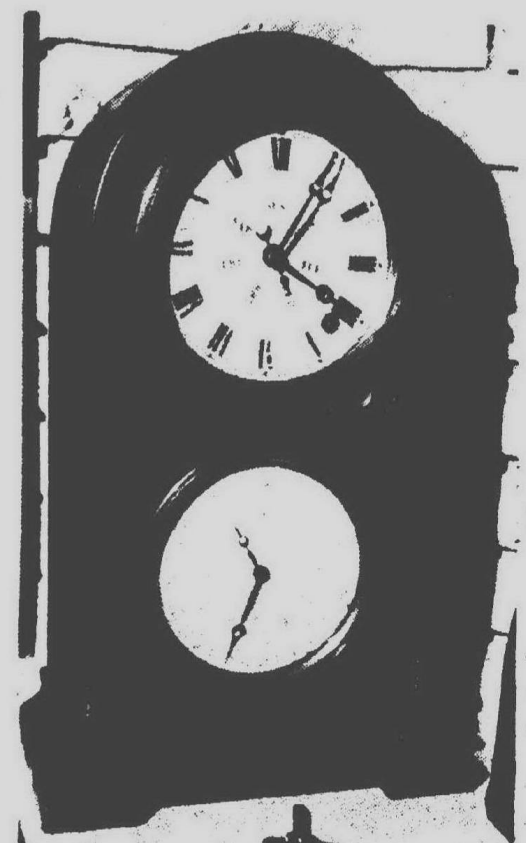
BAKE'S CLOCKS all keep good time and all have their spots in the home decor.

Winding them, he said, is a chore usually done on Sundays. "But they have eight-day mechanisms so it doesn't hurt if you miss a day."

He keeps them set so they aren't exactly together as they tick off the minutes.

"I like to keep a slight gap so they don't all strike at once," he explained.

Even with that gap, 1975 definitely will be heard as it enters this Plymouth household."

## And a stately 'grandfather'



The tall grandfather clock that will chime in the new year for residents of Presbyterian Village in Redford Township is a timepiece that once graced the stately home of a prominent Detroit family.

The clock has been recording minutes of new years since 1894, when it was a gift for the new home of Mr. and Mrs. Oren Scotten and their nine children.

It stood for years at the turn of the immense staircase in the home that Scotten, owner of a tobacco firm and active member of the Fort Street Presbyterian Church, built for his family on several acres of land near Vinewood and West Grand Boulevard.

It was given by the owners of a Cincinnati area farm that grew most of the tobacco Scotten's firm used.

Standing on the stairway beside a stained glass window, the intricately carved clock was witness to many important events in the Scotten family, including the wedding of Priscilla, one of the Scotten daughters, to Dr. Armin A. Darmstaetter Jr., now a Bloomfield Hills physician.

After Mr. Scotten died and the children of the family grew up and scattered, Mrs. Scotten sold the big home and gave several pieces of furniture, including the grandfather clock, to the Presbyterian Home, then known as Hoobler House.

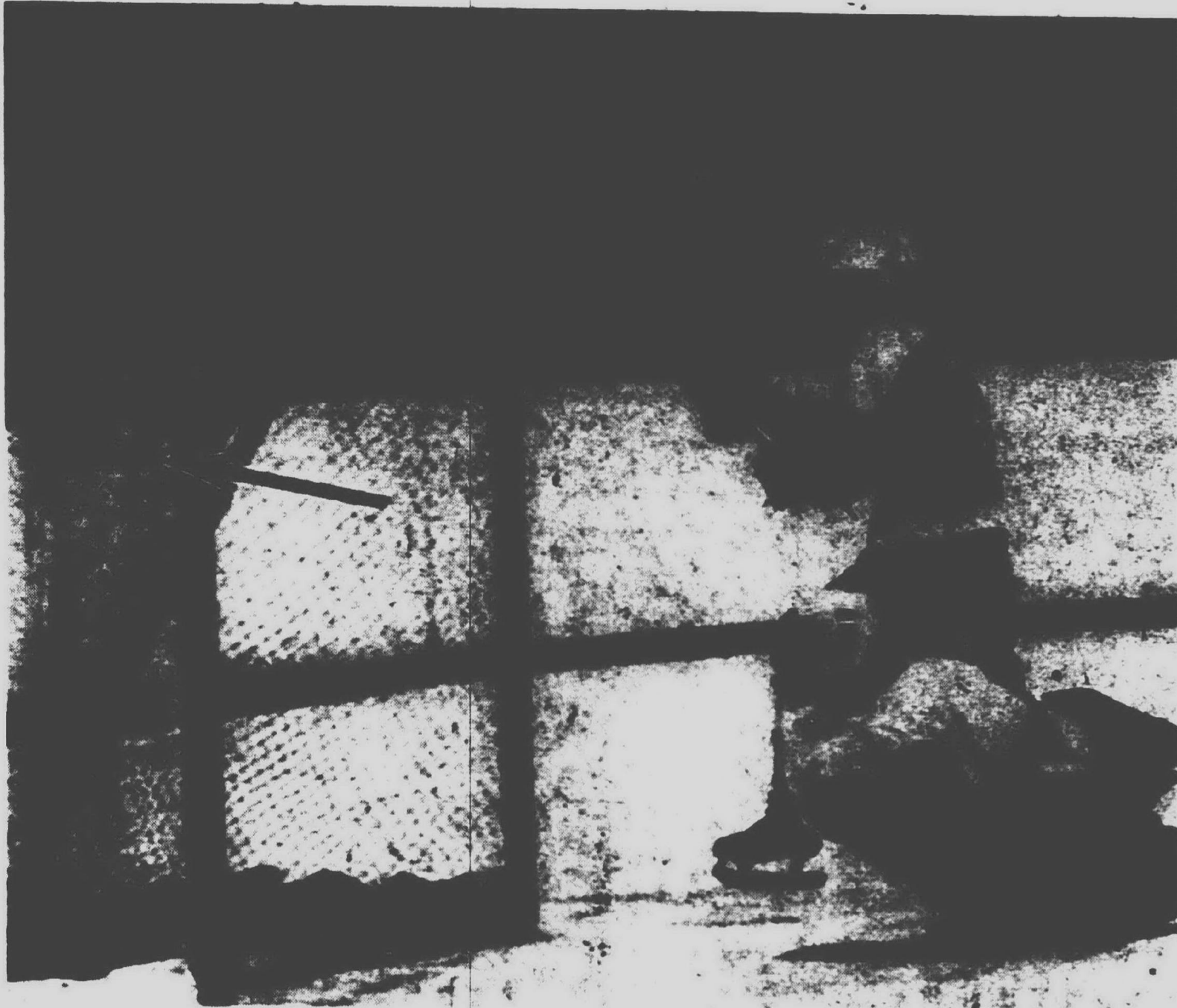
In 1969, Mrs. Mary Brown, an active member of the Presbyterian Village, had new works installed and moved the clock to Patterson Hall of the Redford residence complex for senior citizens.

There residents and visitors alike can read the inscription on the clock face, "Time and Tide Wait for No Man," and hear it chime in each quarter hour as 1974 advances into 1975.

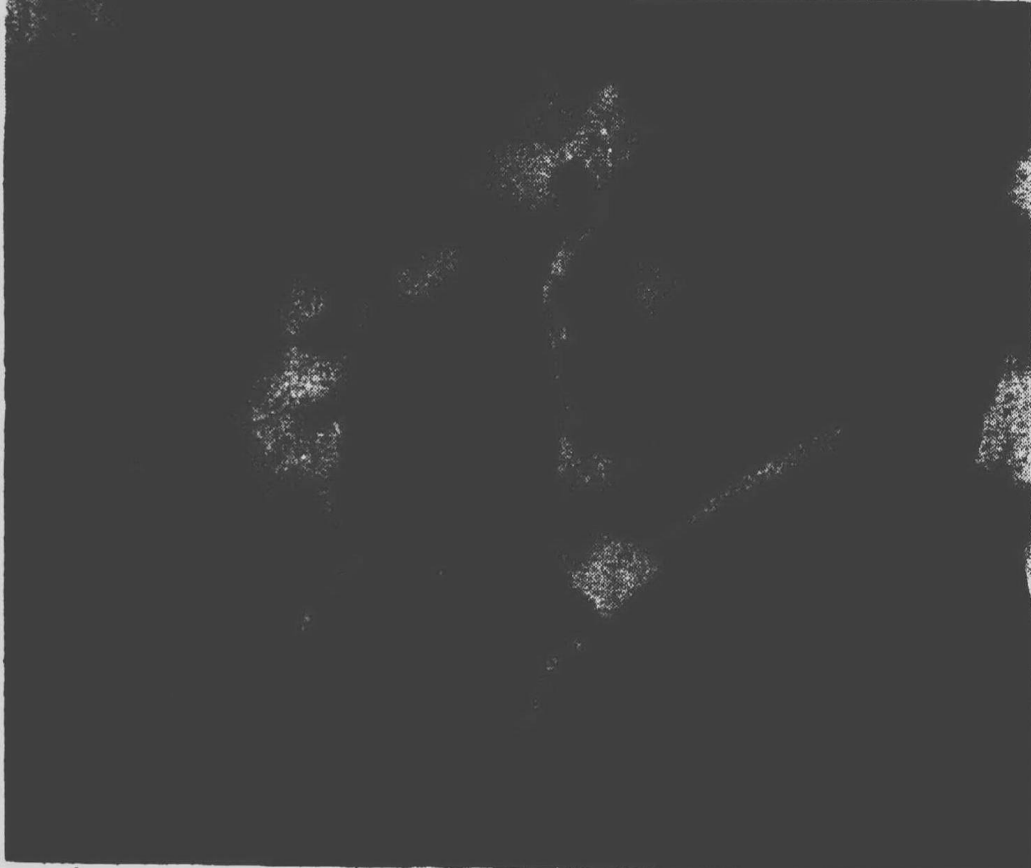

### SALES TAX

ON JANUARY 1, 1975, the amended sales tax act will be in effect. Non-taxable items will include prescription drugs for human use or food for human consumption.

**WHAT IS? AND WHAT ISN'T?** Basically, if you can eat it, it is non-taxable. The majority of food items intended to be eaten outside of the store for human consumption are not taxable.

**PREPARED FOODS** intended for immediate consumption will still be taxable. This means that items purchased such as snack bar items or ice cream cones or coffee and donuts will be taxed. However, for example, the purchase of a dozen donuts to take home will be nontaxable.

**TAXABLE ITEMS** will include alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, pet foods, nonprescription drugs, ice, distilled water, cocktail mixes and seeds. Paper products, soaps, household supplies and all other nonedible items will be taxed.

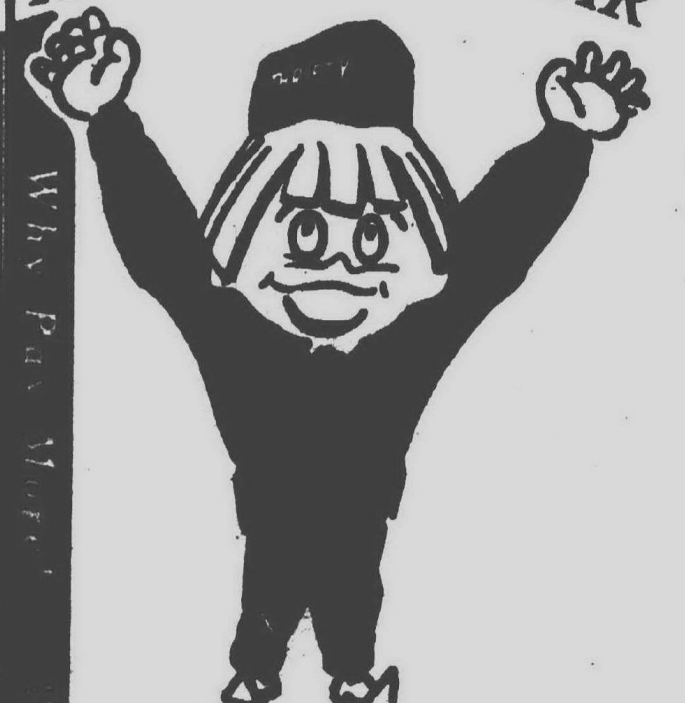
**SEPARATE ORDERS:** We could ring all taxable items first, tax the total, and then ring in all non-taxable items. Not at Meijer. After changes are made on our cash registers, it will NOT be necessary to separate your food from your non-food. The registers will be able to separate the taxable items into a taxable total.
