Township backs no-hunting

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP— The township's no-hunting ordinance took a step west of Beck Road when the board of trustees supported extension of the ordinance from Beck to Napier.

The board unanimously agreed to ask the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to conduct a public hearing on the issue, provided established rifle clubs with adequate enclosed facilities could be exempted from the ban.

The hunting matter was tabled at the board's last meeting, after a group of residents living west of Beck presented a petition in favor of the ordinance extension, to enable township Clerk Helen Richardson to investigate the legal procedures required for the ordinance amendment.

According to Mrs. Richardson, Bruce Andrews of the DNR said the township board must be sure it wants the no-hunting ordinance extended, before it requires a public hearing.

Supervisor J. D. McLaren and representatives from the DNR, the Mich-

igan State Police and the Wayne County Sheriff's Department will conduct the public hearing and submit their recommendation on the ordinance extension to the board of trustees.

The DNR normally recommends hunting bans only in heavily populated or congested areas, Andrews said, on the basis of safety problems.

"Virtually all age groups are firing weapons in that area at all times of the year," said Trustee Richard Gornick. "We're moving toward increased urbanization, and there is a safety hazard. Steel-jacketed bullets will carry in excess of a mile."

"I think it would be irresponsible on the part of the board not to conduct a public hearing," Gornick said, before moving for the hearing request.

If the ordinance is extended to the township's western boundary, hunting and target practicing will be prohibited throughout the township under punishment by a maximum \$500 fine, 90 days in jail or both.

Under the ordinance, residents can engage in archery practice on their premises. The township hopes to exempt the Western Wayne County

Conservation Association, a rifle club on Napier, from the target practicing ban.

"We are concerned about this," a member of the club told board members. "We would like you to consider exempting pre-existing associations like ourselves."

Board members directed Mrs. Richardson to investigate the exemption possibility.

Most residents at Tuesday's meeting were in favor of the hunting ban.

"Someone's going to get killed in the woods near our house," said one resident, who lives on Ridge. "I'd love to walk through those woods and see some of the wildlife. But I'm afraid."

Robert Blessed, 49601 Powell, added, "Our problem is we have to harvest crops on our land. It's quite a feeling when you're on your tractor, and the buck shot is falling all over. They shoot up the land, and then they leave their trash all over."

One Livonia resident who owns land in Plymouth Township said he sold some of his land because of the hunting problem.

Mrs. Richardson related a message she received from the DNR.

"Mr. Andrews told me closing an area to hunting only keeps away people who respect the law," she said. "He said normally they would not close farm land. He further stated that there is a law to control trespassing as well as a Hunters Safety Zone Law, which says that no firearms can be used within 150 yards of a building, unless it is by the owner of the property."

One resident said, "It looks to me that your problem wouldn't be solved by closing that area to hunting. The people are complaining about hunters who are already violating the law."

Blessed disagreed. "I think the board should respect the right of the property owners west of Beck. This gentleman mentioned we should call the Sheriff's Department. When you do call them, it takes them about a half hour to get there."

"Do you know how hard it is to retain a hunter," Blessed asked board members, "when he has a gun and you haven't?"

1st leg of I-275 to open in July

Motorists driving from Ford to Schoolcraft will have a little smoother sailing in July with the opening of the first leg of the I-275 expressway.

The four mile section will prelude the completion of the route from I-94 at the south, to I-96 at the north (near Eleven Mile) in the fall of 1976.

According to State Highway Department Engineer Bruce LaFrance, expressway links within western Wayne County should be completed by the fall of 1977. That includes I-275 and the Schoolcraft expressway (I-96). The extension of the Schoolcraft expressway to Ann Arbor (M-14) is scheduled for completion in the fall of 1978.

LaFrance said the four-mile stretch from Schoolcraft to Ford Road is "virtually completed." The freeway is waiting for warmer weather for the completion of the shoulders, guard rails and a little bit of grass seed and sod.

Construction of the remainder of the approximately 15-mile stretch of freeway is under way with bridge structures, drainage and grading scheduled for this year. Pavement contracts will be let this fall for the remaining sec-

tions and paving should be started in the spring of 1976, followed by opening of the freeway in the fall.

Travelers looking for a quicker east-west route will have to wait one year longer, as completion of the 17-mile section of the Schoolcraft expressway will take until fall of 1977.

At present the I-96 freeway runs from downtown Detroit to Schaefer. By the fall of 1976 the route will be complete to the Southfield expressway.

The stretch of more than 15 miles from Southfield to I-275 will take until the fall of 1977 for completion.

LaFrance said the Schoolcraft expressway has been delayed because one of the prime steel contractors for both the overpasses and roadway, Yeager Steel of Port Huron, went bankrupt.

LaFrance said the construction schedules were premised on receiving all of the federal monies that have been allocated for the projects. He said no other delays have been experienced in either funding or work stoppage and that construction of the expressway has been on schedule since I-275 was begun in 1973.

In fire

"Don't lock yourself to death!" That's the message the Michigan State Fire Chief's Association (MSFCA) is trying to convey to burglar-wary residents, whose key-operated deadbolt locks are helping to keep burglars out and residents in.

The locks are deadly hardware in fire situations, the MSFCA maintains, when poisonous gases of smoke-filled rooms muddle the fire victim's search for the key needed to unlock the inside of the bolted door.

The MSFCA has charged Plymouth Township Fire Chief James Gignac, Westland Chief Ralph Savini and Birmingham Chief G. C. Nunnally with the task of writing a pamphlet to discourage sale and use of the lock.

The pamphlet is earmarked for distribution through Michigan's schools and insurance companies, once a grant from industry is obtained to cover publication costs.

"It appears to me that these locks are putting more emphasis on material possessions than human life," said Gignac. "I can understand the feeling that people are doing the right thing by installing them. But there's

so much emphasis in today's society on crime people overlook other things."

The MSFCA is blaming the locks for four deaths in Avon Township, one in the city of Wayne and one in Warren, where residents apparently could not find the key that would open the lock and doorway to life.

A Livonia woman was found dead last July near the back door of her condominium with the key to the deadbolt lock in the door.

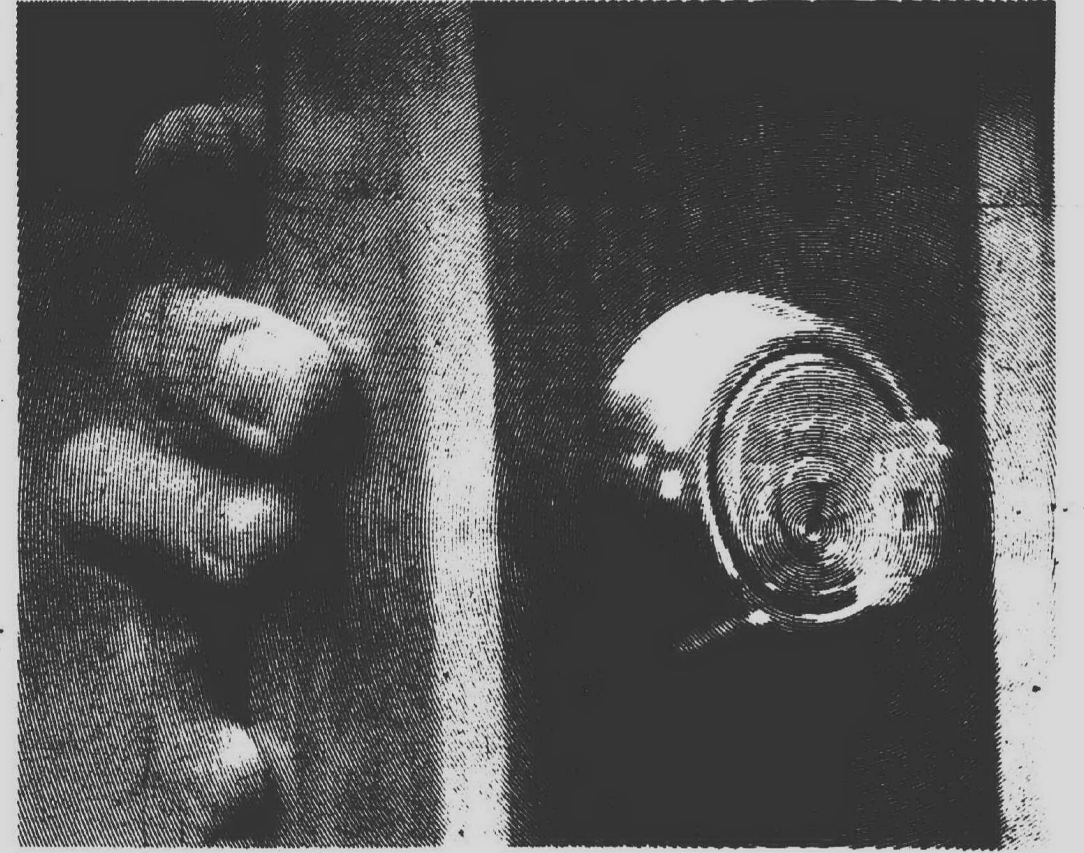
At the time, Livonia Fire Marshal Ted Kovarik theorized that the woman died of smoke inhalation while attempting to unlock the door.

A deadbolt lock in a recent West Bloomfield Township fire hampered a resident from leaving his dwelling but did not cause death. Although inconclusive evidence points to the lock in two other Michigan fire fatalities, the MSFCA believes the locks prevented persons from leaving their homes.

According to Gignac, smoke from a fire contains poisonous gases, such as carbon monoxide and ammonia, that can impair a person's ability to func-

Township kills M-14 hearing

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—The State Highway Department's plans for a proposed interchange at Beck and M-14 will not be disrupted.

That was the decision of the township board of trustees who voted 6-1 against the planning commission's recommendation to request another public hearing.

The State Highway Department held a public hearing on the proposed interchange 10 or 11 years ago. Trustee Frank Millington moved to take no further action on the issue.

Trustee Richard Gornick cast the only dissenting vote.

Millington maintains the Wayne County Road Commission will carry out its plans to make Beck a major four-lane artery, once the interchange is completed. That, he says, will help develop land zoned industrial in the northern portion of the township.

"I am in favor of the interchange," Millington told board members. "At this point, I think it's badly needed from the aspect of state equalized valuation for the schools. To try to stop it at this date would be to no avail."

The Plymouth Township Planning Commission asked the trustees to reopen the interchange issue at the prompting of township resident Irving Rozian, whose land stands in the way of the proposed interchange.

The interchange is not needed, maintained Rozian and other township residents at a recent planning commission meeting, since other interchanges are proposed at Sheldon and Gotfredson.

Rozian told board members the purchase of his property for the interchange cannot be stayed, but he asked the board to request another public hearing.

"I think the community should have one last say on this matter," Rozian said. "A prompt endeavor on your

PLYMOUTH— Unemployment is spurring activity in at least one building on Main Street— the Dunning-Hough Library.

"I can't say what percentage is due to unemployment, but we are getting busier," said head librarian Beth Simescu. "We've noticed people who come into the library during the day who normally are at work."

Circulation of books on home improvement, job resumes, successful job interviews, gardening and personal finances have jumped drastically in the last few months, she said.

"They were always popular," Mrs. Simescu added. "But we bought six additional copies of a job resume book, and they're just never here. Neither are the gardening books. We've noticed a tremendous emphasis in those areas."

Although library personnel has noticed a correlation between unemployment figures and increased business activity, circulation records cannot support their beliefs, according to Mrs. Simescu.

Serving the City of Plymouth and Plymouth and Canton townships, the library sets at the heart of a quickly growing community and serves more residents each year.

Last year's circulation figures, for example, show 13 per cent more books were borrowed in 1974 than the 154,000 books in 1973. Mrs. Simescu said such increases have marked circulation records during the last four years.

About 1,000 more books were taken from the library in January, 1975, than in January, 1974, she said. Circulation figures for this February jumped about 2,000 compared to the same month last year.

"It's difficult to say what increases

are due to unemployment and what's due to growth," Mrs. Simescu said. "But people are more apt to use the library, if they're not working from nine to five. If they're unemployed and come into the library, they're not spending money like they would be bowling or going to a movie."

"You get into the question of whether people are using the library rather than buying books," she added. "We get comments like that over the counter. Now people are more apt to wait for us to get a book rather than buy it."

The increased number is perhaps

largest impact the sour economy has had on the library clientele.

"Men are stopping in in the middle of the day rather than in the evening like they used to," Mrs. Simescu noted. "They come in to take out books on how to fix a leaky faucet or how to fix a chair."

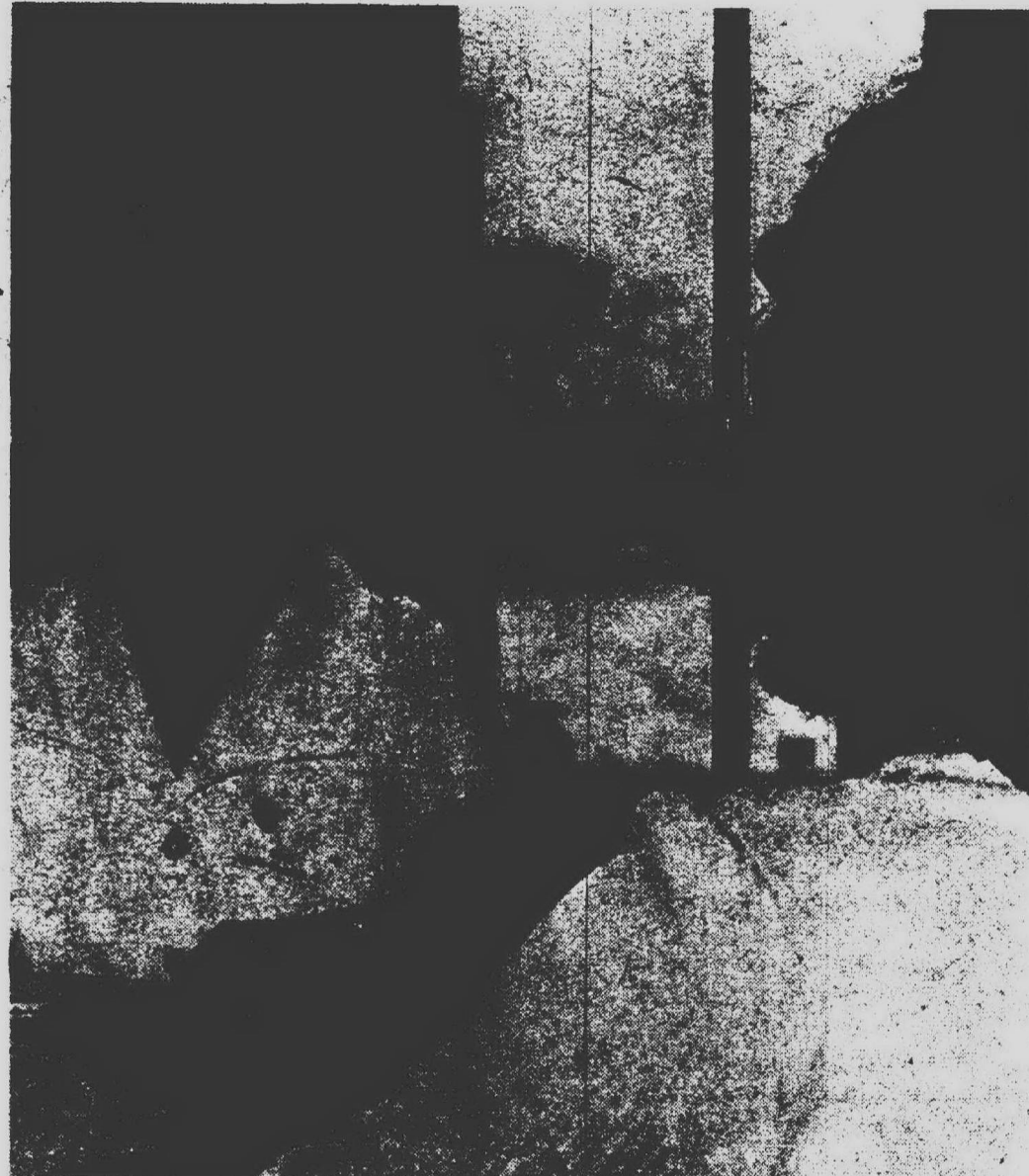

Family support helps too

Nurses' advance with federal funds

When Mrs. Rosemary Mayes of Livonia walks up to receive a bachelor of science degree in nursing from Madonna College on April 26, it will be a live reenactment of a long-time fantasy.

Mother of six children, ranging in age from nine to 19, and employed as a nurse at Hawthorne Center, Mrs. Mayes says, "I never dreamed I could find the time."

And if handing out diplomas were like giving Academy Awards, Mrs. Mayes would probably turn to the audience and say, "I never could have made it without the help of my children and my husband, LaSalle."

"I also want to thank Madonna College and Hawthorn Center for their understanding and encouragement, and the Department of Health Education and Welfare (HEW) for its traineeship grant."

MRS. MAYES more than two years ago joined the growing band of registered nurses who are returning to college to secure a baccalaureate degree.

However, last year, Madonna College received federal funds to put into effect a financial aid program for people just like her.

They were HEW traineeship grants for working nurses who wanted to update their education or earn a degree. Their purpose was to prepare nurses for teaching, clinical specialties, or leadership positions in administration and supervision.

"I knew I wouldn't get as far as I wanted without a degree," said Mrs. Mayes. "I wanted to broaden my horizons and get into such material as art, English and history that you don't get in a basic nursing course."

While carrying 13 credit hours at Madonna, Mrs. Mayes is on the job four days a week at Hawthorn Center, a place where she would like to continue working.

"I want to work in a psychiatric setting," she declared.

Apparently not the type to let a single blade of grass grow under her feet, the busy Mrs. Mayes spends her summers as director of the YMCA's Storer Camp, located near Jackson.

BUT SHE IS not the only registered nurse knocking herself out to obtain higher education at Madonna under a HEW traineeship grant.

Mrs. Gloria Pummill of Garden City daily scurries between a job in Wayne County General Hospital in Westland, classes at Madonna, and her husband, Bob, and their four children.

"The three-year nurse is almost extinct," said Mrs. Pummill, who works in the hospital's psychiatric department. "I feel my job will be more secure with a degree."

She always wanted to go on with her education to teach nursing subjects. When employed at Northville State Hospital, she enjoyed helping nurses from other hospitals who were brought in to learn how to treat a psychiatric patient.

"I still work with students at Wayne County and they are a delight," she said.

Mrs. Pummill recognizes the encouragement she has received from her family while continuing her schooling.

"Most of my professors and the sisters at the college have been very helpful," she added. "My counselor, Sister Mary Humilitas, has helped a lot. It's the kind of encouraging atmosphere that does a lot for you when you might be down a bit."

SIX STUDENTS received these federal grants for the 1974-75 school year, with the college already planning to ask for twice as much money next year to help 10-12 persons.

Living up to affirmative action principles, Madonna chose a man as one of the six grant recipients. He is Allen Weinstein of Allen Park. The others are Melvina Cochran of Detroit, Jean-

nette Forest of Lincoln Park, and Wanda Ellis of Rochester.

To qualify, an applicant must be a U.S. citizen, graduate of an approved school of nursing, currently licensed as a professional nurse, able to enroll in a fulltime study program, and planning to use the training to continue a career in nursing.

"It is good for the government to recognize the need for an educated nursing personnel," said Mrs. Noreen O'Neill, chairperson of Madonna's nursing department.

"Those who win these grants will be

guiding practical nurses and others who haven't had an opportunity to study for a bachelor's degree in nursing.

"In a hospital setting you need professional nurses who understand management principles and can thus enhance the job satisfaction of other personnel."

"It improves patient care when a nurse has been exposed to advanced theories in the nursing process and in science support areas."

MRS. O'NEILL finds it especially important that in the Madonna pro-

gram nurses are exposed to the community health situation.

"Our students are required to take a course that sends them out into the public health area," she stated. "I think this is really fine. We're having to look more at the health care delivery system today. Already there are more community health plans."

"Public health nursing is becoming more prominent because it is felt that not everyone should be hospitalized."

Madonna also offers its nurses courses in leadership, gerontology and management principles.

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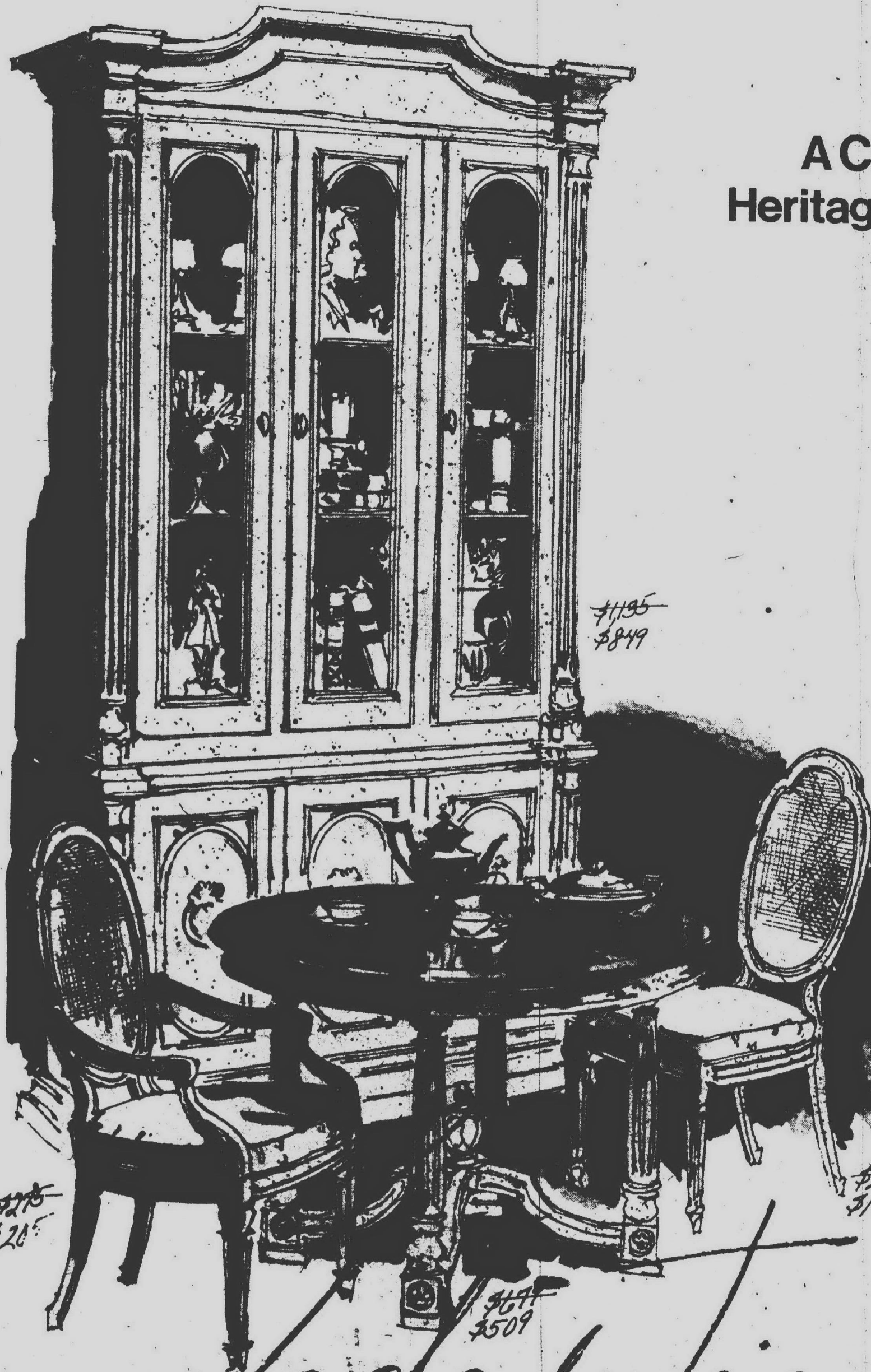


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Necessity confirmed for city street paving

PLYMOUTH—The first step towards resurfacing 11 streets in the city has been approved unanimously by the city commission.

But residents on the affected streets appeared less than pleased with the city's plans as they packed into commission chambers Monday night to voice their disapproval of the plans.

Portions of seven streets are being considered for blacktopping, while portions of eight streets require base

stabilization and a new surface, according to city engineer Allen Gove.

While most residents said their streets were in need of repaving, the sentiment was to wait until times are better.

Estimated costs in the blacktopping program are set at \$3.64 per front foot. Residents on those streets receiving the strengthened base will be assessed \$6.91 per front foot.

According to Gove, streets in the repaving program were last paved more than 20 years ago.

Residents questioned why some streets only needed blacktopping, while others needed the base stabilization. City Manager Fred Yockey said that Gove's soil samplings and visual inspections of the area had established the need for the program.

Other residents living in the northwest section of the city complained their streets had been damaged by DPW trucks that use their streets as access to the DPW yard on Junction.

The most vocal complaints came from those on Auburn and Arthur streets who also said heavy salt trucks use their streets during the winter to deliver salt to the DPW yard.

DPW superintendent Kenneth Vogras said the city does not operate any trucks large enough to do damage to the streets. He added however, that the salt trucks were supposed to use Harvey Street as access to the Junction Street yard.

Countering arguments to wait until times are better, Yockey said, "You're going to get as good a price this year as at any other time. We're talking about a massive program, where the costs are lower because of the number of streets involved."

Some residents suggested that the paving be done as a city-wide project, particularly those who complained about truck traffic on their streets.

Commissioner Joseph Bida, said he felt it would not be fair to residents of the city who had already paid for street repaving to also foot the total bill for the 11 streets under consideration.

Mayor Beverly McAninch added the city has by policy paid 37.5 per cent of the improvements in the past and will do the same in both paving programs currently being considered.

The total estimated cost of both projects is \$209,000 with the city allocating \$74,000 in federal revenue sharing money for its portion. The remaining \$135,000 will be borne by the residents.

The city commission voted unanimously to confirm the necessity of the blacktopping program and reached a 6-1 vote, with commissioner Norbert Battermann dissenting, on the base stabilization and repaving project.

The next step for the repaving projects will be to confirm the assessment roll for the project. That hearing is expected to come before the commission in early May.

According to the tentative schedule for the project bids would be let by July 1, with construction completed by September.

Probation aide classes begin

PLYMOUTH—The probation department of the 35th District Court will sponsor its first community-wide training program for adults interested in becoming volunteer probation officers.

The four-session program will begin at 7:30 p.m. April 10 and continue on consecutive Thursday evenings through May 1. The group will meet in room 128 of Plymouth Canton High School, Canton Center Rd., south of Joy Rd.

Sessions will include presentations by attorneys, District Court Judge Dunbar Davis, staff members and experienced volunteer probation officers. The program will explain the nation-wide volunteer probation officer program, providing training in several counseling techniques.

The volunteer program in the Plymouth-Canton area is patterned after the program pioneered by Judge Keith Leenhouts in Royal Oak 16 years ago. The volunteer is placed in

a one-to-one counseling relationship with "first-time" or persons convicted of misdemeanors, who are 17 or older.

According to chief probation officer Alan Wakenhut, the district court now has more than 90 volunteer probation officers and 14 staff members in the Plymouth-Canton-Northville areas.

"With the case load growth in these areas, many more volunteers, both men and women, are needed if we are to continue to be able to assign all probationers referred to us," Wakenhut said.

Wakenhut said the premise of the program is that friendship and trust of the volunteer can be a "significant factor" in rerouting the offender from criminal activity. He added that individuals who attend the training program are not obligated to become volunteer probation officers until all four sessions have been completed.

Chemicals cause fire

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—A chemical fire at Ford Motor Co.'s Sheldon Road plant kept firefighters busy for five hours morning.

A holding tank, which contained a catalyst used in the manufacture of plastic car heaters, caught fire when the catalyst exploded.

The fire was confined to the hold-

ing tank, and no injuries or property damage were reported, according to Sgt. F. Honke.

Fire Chief James Gignac said the plant's fire brigade had already brought the flames under control, when township firefighters arrived at 7:20 a.m. About 20 firefighters remained at the scene until noon to cool off the tank.

Kobierzynski wants liquor license confusion cleared

Believing it necessary to present his side of the controversy over the two liquor licenses held by the former owners of the Thunderbird Inn, Arthur Kobierzynski has asked the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees for time to appear at a regular meeting.

In a letter to the board, Attorney Paul Nine, counsel for Kobierzynski, explains it has been represented to the trustees that the former owners of the Thunderbird Inn hold two liquor licenses and that neither was available to Dean Baker, the current owner of the Thunderbird Inn.

The Thunderbird Inn was closed last fall when Investors Diversified Services Inc. foreclosed on a \$4.5 million mortgage. Since that time it has been turned over to Baker to complete the new motel-cocktail lounge complex.

Baker has resumed work on the project, which lay idle for the better part of two years for lack of funds to continue construction. Baker hopes to have the project open for use by June 1.

In his letter, Nine writes its purpose is to dispel any misconceptions which may have been created in the minds of the board of trustees and to assure it that his client is not attempting to monopolize the available liquor licenses in Plymouth Township.

He points out that Kobierzynski has always dealt in good faith with the

trustees when he has appeared before them in the past.

His communication says the true facts are:

• Arthur Kobierzynski was one of the original owners of the Thunderbird Inn and as such held a liquor license in the name of Kobierzynski, Klein and Carlo D/B/A Thunderbird Inn. This license was a class C permit issued by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission under which the aforesaid co-partnership operated Thunder-

part may get another review, before the ground is torn up."

Millington retorted, "I live by that interchange, and I've been there 25 years. This road has been planned for 22 years. It's included in our master land use plan. I don't think this board should be used to further the personal interests of a few individuals."

Gornick disagreed. "I would respectfully disagree with Mr. Millington on many points. The township was not in favor of this interchange 10 or 11 years ago. Interchanges exercise a dramatic impact on adjacent areas. It would be responsible to have all opinions aired once again."

"I'm not enamored with turning Beck into a truck artery," Gornick continued. "I will vote against the motion."

Township Clerk Helen Richardson summed up the views of other board members.

"You're going to be barking up the wrong tree by asking for this public hearing," she said. "It's already predetermined."

Trustee Russell Ash said, "I believe there should be an interchange at Beck and M-14. The only question in

my mind has to do with its timing. I don't think you should dump out the traffic on an unimproved Beck Road."

Treasurer Joe West added, "I think the need is there, and I think the road will be improved when the interchange is there."

Trial date set for shotgun slaying

CANTON—May 8 has been set as the trial date for Barry Provow, 27, his wife Leslie, 18, and Robert Umney, accused in the Jan. 27 murder of Canton resident Terry L. Buchman.

The date was set at a pretrial hearing held April 8.

The prosecution listed 29 witnesses, the attorney for Umney, Robert Delaney, said he will file a motion for a delay in the trial date to further examine the evidence and prosecution witness list.

Gary Davis, attorney for Leslie Provow, requested a dismissal or reduction of the first degree murder charge against his client and a hearing has

been scheduled for April 18 to discuss his plea.

No special prosecutor has been assigned by the county to the murder case yet.

tion and think clearly. Under such circumstances, a fumbling search for a key can be a deadly venture.

"Every time people see movies or newspaper pictures of fire, they don't see the smoke," Gignac said. "This is why firefighters carry breathing units. We know how much heat our lungs can stand."

"People are under the assumption they have 15 or 20 minutes to get out of a fire," he said. "But it only takes a couple of breaths of poisonous gas, and they can no longer function. Why put an obstacle in their way that, under normal circumstances, they can manipulate?"

Until recently, the Michigan State Police promoted the lock as a good barrier against burglary. But, under pressure from the MSFCA, the Fire Marshall's Division of the Michigan

State Police and other organizations, the state police have changed their recommendation to a noncommittal stand.

"Before we said it was the best lock for security and burglaries," said Trooper Michael Garrison of the Plymouth post of the Michigan State Police. "Now we let people make up their own minds. We feel we should mention the locks, but we're bound to mention the fire hazards."

The key-operated deadbolt lock prevents burglars from taking such large possessions as television sets that cannot fit through a window, some persons maintain.

But, as Gignac pointed out, a burglar could remove the pins from a door equipped with a deadbolt lock, swing the door open the opposite way and remove any large possessions that fit through the doorway.

bird Inn from the early 1960s through January 1972.

• Since January 1972, Kobierzynski, Klein and Carlo sold their interest in the Thunderbird Inn and retained the liquor license under which they had previously operated the Inn.

• The new owner, Thunderbird Investment Corporation, applied for and received the BH license with which to operate the restaurant, the Thunderbird Inn. This license was held in escrow by the Liquor Control Commission pending completion of the necessary steps for its issuance.

• At no time has Baker approached Kobierzynski with respect to the license he held at the Thunderbird Inn.

• While Kobierzynski is a shareholder in Thunderbird Investment Corporation, he is not an officer or director of the corporation, but he has been

informed that Dean Baker has not offered to purchase the license held in escrow for the Thunderbird Investment Corporation. Kobierzynski is further informed that IDS, the mortgage lender, was offered the license held in escrow for Thunderbird Investment Corporation for use by Baker, but Baker refused the license for the stated reason he did not need the license and had no need for it."

The letter asks "If you feel it would be beneficial for us to appear before the Board of Trustees so as to correct any misconceptions which may have been created in the minds of any board members, we would be happy to do so at your pleasure."

Plymouth Township Clerk Helen Richardson acknowledged receipt of the communication but didn't know what the board would do.

On top of these things, interest turned to hockey and skiing in the winter months, and games such as tennis moved indoors. Years ago no one would have thought about playing tennis at night. But they're doing it now.

WHILE THIS CHANGE was taking place professional football took hold and now, more than ever, it is the working man's sport.

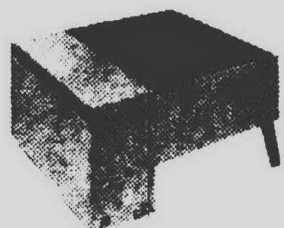

The prestigious Plymouth Symphony Orchestra, which has made the community a place of "sweet airs that give delight" for the past 29 years, grew out of a small group of string players who got together to play for their own entertainment in 1945.

Not that Plymouth had been bereft of musical entertainment, mostly of the brass variety, down through the years. Michael Conner, who played the cornet, organized and led the first Plymouth band in the mid-1800's. Band members, and others interested in music, used to gather at the hardware store which Conner founded, in

1851, at the corner of Main and Penniman.

"Quartets were always on hand and each Saturday night during the long winters there would be plenty of music echoing among the Conner store's dishpans, cookstoves and pitchforks," recalled Charlie Bennett, who was born here in 1863.

At a later period, the brass band which performed at the Plymouth Fair from 1886 to 1903 did its share to add to the gaiety of the occasion. Photos are also in existence of a Plymouth Cornet Band (1890) and a Plymouth Brass Band (1905 to 1913).

Musical comedies and minstrel shows staged at Amity Hall (1869-1893) and at the Opera House, located over the old Village Hall, also had the community tapping its feet to tunes ranging from the sublime to the ridiculous.

None of these early musical efforts was, of course, in the same league as the Plymouth Symphony. Foundation of the Symphony Orchestra, involving,

as it did, talented amateur and professional musicians from Plymouth and 16 surrounding cities, and attracting audiences from the 35 different communities in southeast Michigan, was a major cultural advance in the history of the entire area.

It all began in Carl Groschke's Feed Store.

Fred Beitner, one of the original group, says the few musicians from which the Plymouth Symphony evolved first got together at the Feed Store at 637 South Main Street, in the building which now houses the Anderson Music Store.

Groschke, with his bass viol; his wife, Evelyn Woods, with her piano; and Roy Pursell, with his violin, began to play together in Groschke's store. Pursell, father of State Senator Carl Pursell, had a stationery store in the same building.

Beitner, who played the violin, and who was a neighbor of the Pursell's, was invited to join. The group grew and soon graduated from the back of the feed store—amidst the bags of chicken feed, seeds and fertilizers—to the Groschke home of Mill Street, near the corner of Pearl. There Evelyn could have access to her grand piano.

Mr. Beitner remembers that some of those who joined the group did not stay long. Among the original members, in addition to the Groschke's, Pursell and Beitner, were: Daisy Barnes, viola; William Bateman, clarinet; Jens Pedersen, violin; Tom Houghton, trumpet; Ardis Curtiss Long, violin; Leo Kowalcik, viola; Art Baker, cello; David Mather, clarinet; Kenneth Greer, violin; and Virginia Fischer, horn.

Merely a group of amateur musicians, playing together for their own entertainment, they had no inkling of the grand events which were to be thrust on them. Things might have remained at that level but for the appearance in Plymouth of a catalyst and prime mover in the person of Paul Wagner.

Wagner, who came to Plymouth in 1946 as musical supervisor in Plymouth High School, had played in symphony orchestras in other cities. He had a burning desire to conduct one of his own. The problem was where to find one. In the words of Leopold Stokowski, "If one wishes to play the piano and make it one's life work, it is not too difficult to reach a piano; but if one wishes to conduct a symphony orchestra, it is extremely difficult to practice the instrument, the symphony orchestra, because a large orchestra is very costly."

Wagner had graduated from the Baldwin-Wallace Conservatory of Music and studied at Western Reserve and at the University of Michigan. During World War II, he directed Army, Navy and WAC bands at Paris Island, Northern China, Guam and Okinawa. He had played in, and occasionally conducted, symphony orchestras in Charleston, Medina and Toledo.

As soon as he arrived in Plymouth, Wagner began investigating available talent and interest in music with the thought of organizing a symphony orchestra. He soon learned of the group that met at Groschke's. In the fall of 1946 he asked the amateur musicians if they would like to form a symphony orchestra.

Fred Beitner recalls the amazement with which the handful of players heard Wagner's suggestion.

"Just the very thought of forming a symphony orchestra staggered us," he told me recently. "We thought of ourselves, if anything, as a chamber music group. We had played at an installation of Eastern Star officers and on a few other occasions locally, without pay, but the idea of starting a symphony orchestra had never entered our minds."

Inside the back cover Ma Bell has color photographs of its new design line telephones now available to customers.

For the first time, the yellow pages offer a series of tips for consumers. These are the result of cooperative efforts between the Better Business Bureau of Detroit and Michigan Bell.

Included are such hints as how to get best results when complaining to a company about a faulty product, how to use a layaway plan, what to look for when purchasing a dishwasher or how to cope with the metric system.

Wilson indicated it will take the better part of two weeks to complete delivery of the new directories.

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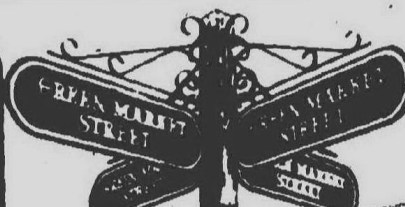
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County ponders court contracts calling for 21 per cent pay hike

The ways and means committee of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners has in its hands contracts for court employees which contain salary adjustments of 21 per cent — plus pension costs — or about 7 per cent a year rather than the basic 4½ per cent.

These contracts are for court attorneys, referees and court reporters for the Common Pleas, Recorder's, Probate and Circuit courts. They are retroactive to July 1973 and '74.

COMMISSIONER MARY DUMAS (R-Livonia), comments on the contracts:

"I realize these contracts were negotiated in good faith by employees and the labor board, and that they have been in the process of bargaining for two years in the instance of court attorneys and referees and almost three years for court reporters for whom this is a new bargaining unit.

"I am aware also that some of these salary adjustments are intended to bring these employees up to the level of other employees in similar classifications at the county level.

"However, the amount of these adjustments weren't included in the budget plans for this year and our fiscal advisor has indicated that we will

be about \$1 million over our allocation for salary increases.

"The Board of Auditors indicates Wayne County will probably end up with a \$6.7 million deficit this year."

MRS. DUMAS said there are only three options open to the board of commissioners.

"I am opposed to the first — deficit spending. In fact, that is why I voted 'no' on the proposed budget for this fiscal year, realizing it was based on an unrealistic picture of anticipated revenues.

"I am reluctant to accept the second option of a flat across the board cut of 10 per cent because it would mean laying off many worthy county employees at a time when unemployment is at an all-time high and governments' efforts are bent toward creating job opportunities."

Mrs. Dumas said the only acceptable alternative is that department heads, and especially the courts and Wayne County General Hospital, be required to come up with and perhaps increase their mandatory savings.

So far the Juvenile Court has been the only court to consistently come up with the mandatory savings. Because this will require cuts in all budgets, I would like to see the board of commissioners through the labor board ask the county employee unions to lay all their contracts back on the table for renegotiation of the third year.

"In private industry the UAW, through Bard Young and other labor leaders, has shown its willingness to reopen bargaining — asking workers to forego this year's pay increases — even to take pay reductions or work four-day weeks rather than have fellow workers laid off.

"I would hope that our county units would be willing to take steps in this direction."

IN A RELATED statement, Mrs. Dumas said:

"I believe for the long run the county board of commissioners is going to have to take a hard look at whether we can afford to continue paying employees at levels which are far above what private business and industry pays or can afford.

"When government does so it increases the inflationary pressures and makes mere existing more difficult for marginal businesses and for families and individuals living on law and fixed incomes, such as our senior citizens."

"In the long run, it adds to the taxpayers' burden by driving many businesses out of the market, thereby reducing jobs and relief rolls."

This will be a very difficult year for the county as it is for the state and local units of government, she added.

"Unfortunately, as our source of revenues decrease, our problems and the services required of the county will increase.

"Crime, juvenile delinquency, alcohol and drug abuse, mental illness, and public health and social service needs, all increase with unemployment."

"I hope Congress diverts funds from such enticing projects as the Michigan State University study of 'the sexual habits of migrating females' to providing the badly-needed appropriations for the yet unfunded Juvenile Delinquency Act of 1974 and the under-funded programs for mental health."

Mrs. Dumas, whose 19th District also includes Northville and Northville Township, is a member of the county's human resources committee, acting chairman of the Juvenile Facility Network executive committee, and a county representative on the Detroit-Wayne County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council.

Hearing on aged needs will be held in Livonia

A hearing in Livonia is among six public hearings scheduled this month by the Detroit-Wayne County Area Agency on Aging to hear residents' views on the needs of senior citizens.

The hearing will be Thursday, April 24, beginning at 10 a.m. in the Livonia Senior Citizens Center, 15218 Farmington Road south of Five Mile.

On Friday, April 25, a 10 a.m. hearing will be held in the Romulus City Council chambers at 11111 Wayne Road.

Members of the agency's 15-member board of directors will participate in the hearings. The agency's funding objectives for the fiscal year beginning July 1 will be outlined and public reaction will be encouraged.

The resulting area plan will be submitted to the Michigan Office on Aging to qualify Wayne County programs for the aged for a total of \$715,860 under the U.S. Older Americans Act.

The proposed plan is available for review at the agency's offices, 2516 David Stott Building, 1150 Griswold, Detroit, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Major objective of the plan are development of health preventive and counseling programs.

Legal aides expand lawyers' time

The American Bar Association (ABA) acknowledges there is a sur-

plus of young lawyers seeking work in the job market.

So, what is the American Bar Association doing helping Madonna College set up a new law course?

They are trying to make lawyers time more valuable by helping establish a legal assistant training program designed to open up jobs for para-legal employees.

THIS FALL Madonna College will introduce a two-year associate degree and a four-year bachelor's degree for legal assistants.

Students in the class will be taught research techniques and legal procedure by practicing attorneys. The program is not designed for students who intend to go on in their schooling and enter law school.

The training will include how to find information in law libraries, how to

conduct prepatory interviews and prepare casework such as the drafting of routine wills.

They cannot counsel clients, plead cases or finalize any contracts but the ABA feels para-legal aids can free lawyer's valuable time to perform more crucial matters that must be handled by a licensed attorney.

MICHIGAN HAS been slow to hire legal assistants but they are used extensively in states such as California and New York.

"My law firm has not hired a legal assistant yet," said Patrick Duggan, president of the Livonia Bar Association. "But that is because few schools in this state, if any, offered the training."

"Madonna is probably the first college in the state to push this type of

legal training. From what I hear about the success of legal assistants in other states, I see a definite use for these people in our law firm."

"For example we have six men in our law firm. 'We might say, 'Do we want to hire another lawyer or could we expand our practice using a legal assistant?'"

MADONNA IS hoping that because they are one of the first colleges in the state to offer a legal assistance degree there will be jobs for students who earn the degree in "a pioneer profession."

"We're appealing to the lawyer's mercenary side in finding employment for these legal assistants," says Dennis Bozyk, Madonna's legal studies counselor and chairman of the school's social science department.

"The ABA studies on this project show legal assistants are out there doing research work at \$5 and \$6 an hour while freeing the lawyer to spend their professional time with clients at \$40 an hour."

"The legal assistants are highly qualified people," Bozyk said. "They provide the lawyer with the opportunity to do more vital work that can only be done by an attorney."

One of the teachers already signed for the fall term is Austin Anderson who is the chairman of the special committee on legal assistants for the ABA and director of the Institute of Continuing Legal Education at the University of Michigan.

The two courses offered in the fall are "legal assistant orientation" and "legal research and procedures."

Lobby to fight income tax hike

A citizens committee been formed by the Michigan Citizens Lobby to work towards the rollback of the recent 0.7 per cent increase in the state income tax.

The action was decided upon after the group completed a public opinion poll which revealed that 79 per cent of the state's taxpayers are opposed to an income tax, favoring instead a hike in luxury, nuisance and business taxes if more state revenue is really needed.

DECLARING THAT these are hard times when taxes ought to be going down rather than up, Lobby Director Barbara Grossman says:

"Using the power of petition granted us by the constitution, we intend to take back those tax dollars and put them where they belong — in the pockets of working people."

"At a time when the federal government finally is granting some much needed tax cuts to help middle-income persons trapped in this recession, it makes absolutely no sense for the state to turn around and take it back from us by raising the state income tax."

According to Ms. Grossman, results of the poll along with a list of alternative means to raise state revenue that wouldn't hit middle-income and working families so hard were recently presented to legislative leaders.

Despite efforts to head off an increase by Senators William Fitzgerald (D-Detroit) and John Bowman (D-Warren), says Ms. Grossman, "a majority of legislators favored taking the easy way out by hitting the middle class again rather than turning to those who can better afford higher taxes."

"WHEN WE JOINED with more than a million Michigan shoppers last fall to eliminate the sales tax on food and medicine, the lobby also pledged to fight any income tax increase this year."

"And we intend to keep our word." The committee formed to roll back the 0.7 per cent income tax increase, Citizens to Cut Unfair Taxes (CUT), is similar to the coalition led by the

lobby in the successful effort to repeal the food and drug tax in Michigan.

The committee will unveil the contents of its campaign after all members of the committee have been consulted, says Ms. Grossman who also indicated the proposal would be fiscally responsible and wouldn't deprive the state treasury of any needed revenue.

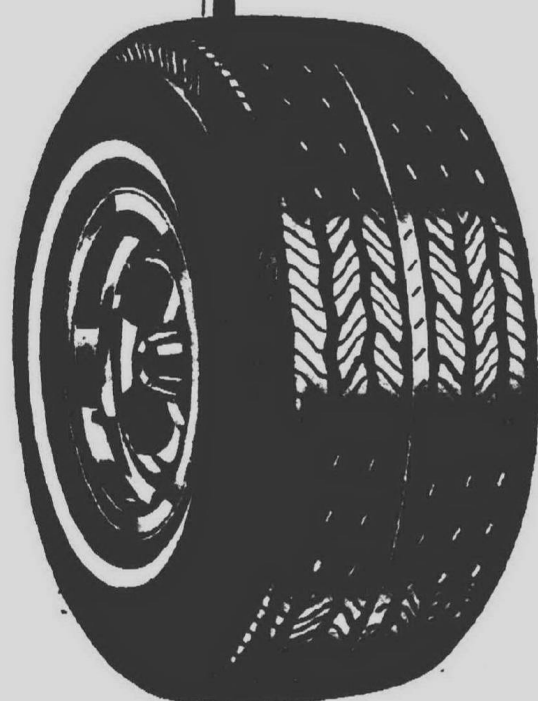
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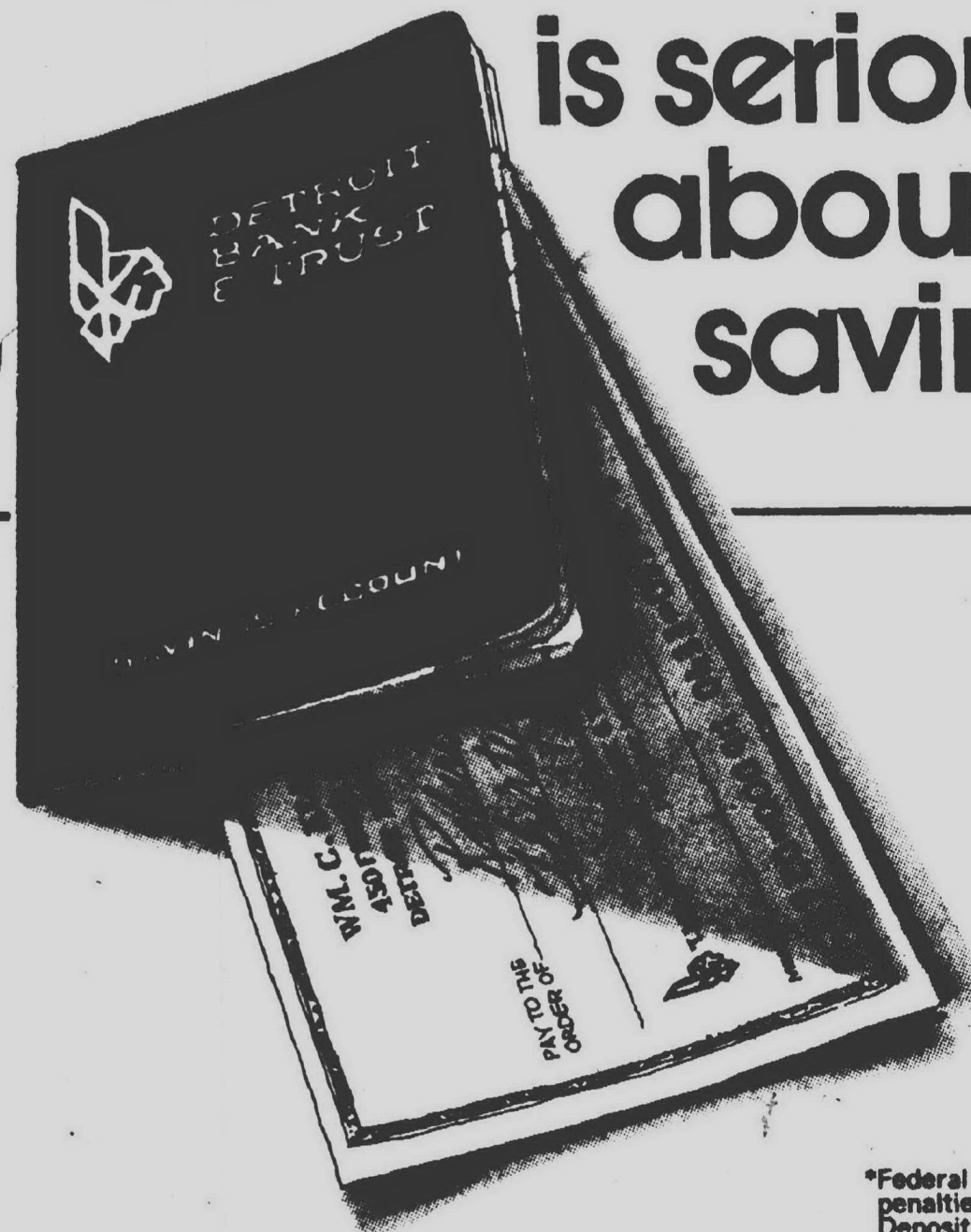
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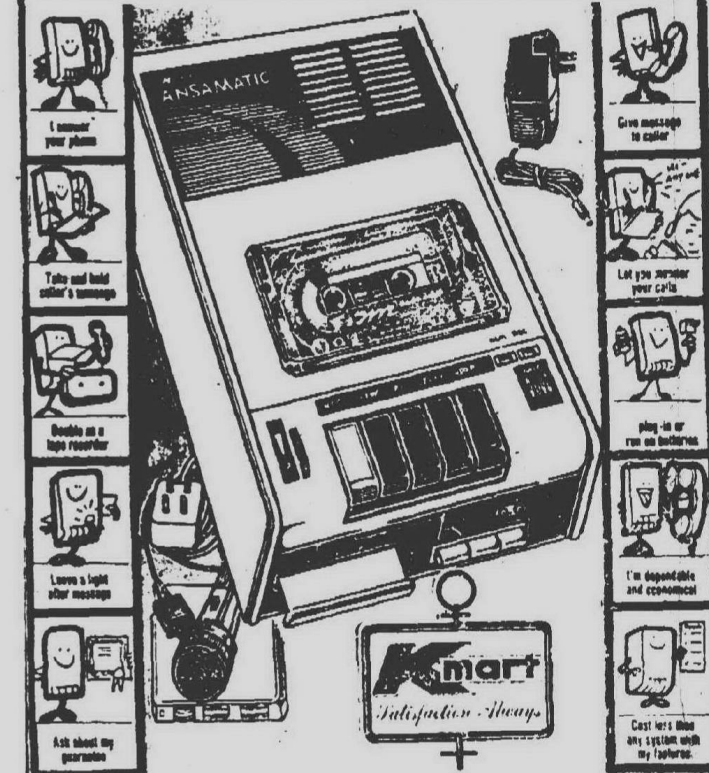
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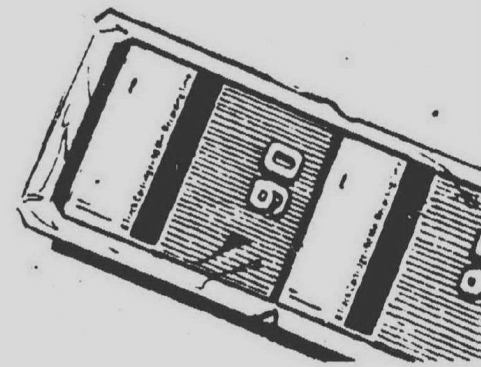
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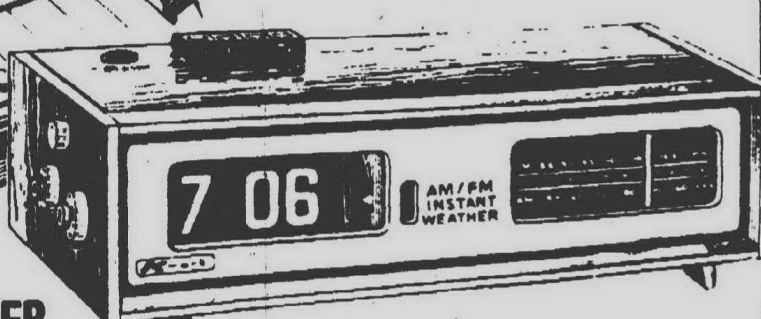
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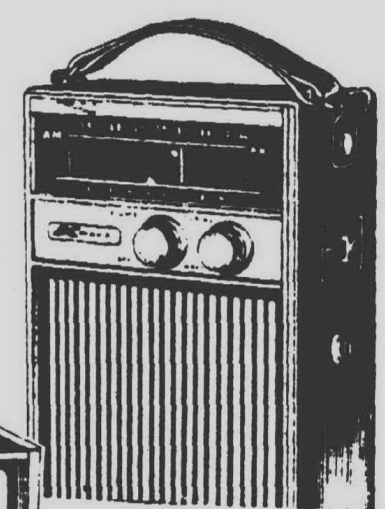
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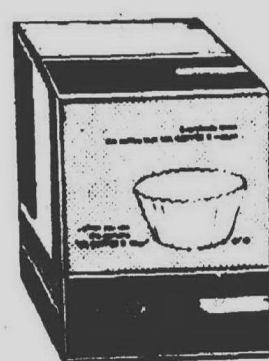
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John DiPonio dies in work site fall

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Insurance costs drive up hospital room rates

While all the furor over soaring costs of malpractice insurance for doctors has been disturbing folks, it's time to relate how these rate increases are going to affect anyone who has use of a hospital.

Malpractice premiums for doctors have skyrocketed to the point where many members of the profession are thinking of getting out. They know they can't afford to pay the insurance without making their charges for services reflect the increase.

But now a new angle has entered the picture, one that hasn't been mentioned in most of the malpractice news releases.

What about the hospitals who suddenly have discovered their costs for such insurance has tripled and quadrupled in the last two or three years? A hospital can't very well say it is being forced out of business by the high cost of insurance, but if it

was in any other business its management would consider quitting.

A CHECK OF area hospitals shows malpractice insurance costs have climbed so high that most are thinking of increasing room service rates. So in the end, it is the patient who will bear the additional costs.

That means a demand from Blue Cross-Blue Shield and similar hospitalization plans for a hike in rates. In turn, that reflects back to the patient or to the company carrying his insurance.

The malpractice insurance premium for St. Mary Hospital in Livonia has jumped from \$137,000 two years ago to more than \$400,000 this year. This for a hospital that has had an excellent record.

As a result of the increased insurance costs, St.

Mary Hospital is considering an increase of \$8 to \$10 for room service. Take into consideration that St. Mary has been operated so efficiently it has been able to keep daily charges down to a much lower rate than many hospitals in the metropolitan Detroit area.

Botsford Hospital, which faces an increase of more than 20 per cent and a premium of \$119,000, figures it costs each patient \$1.25 daily to help pay the insurance costs.

Garden City Osteopathic wasn't prepared at this time to release any figures for the insurance, but an administrator said it would be much higher. The board of directors will meet later in the month to determine future action.

ALTHOUGH ALL hospitals point to malpractice insurance rates causing some of the financial difficulties they are facing, management points to extreme cost increases of high volume items used in patient care.

For example, suction catheters increased 117 per cent in one year; polyethylene bags, 145 per cent; and ampicillin, 128 per cent. Sheets and patient gowns have climbed an average of 33 per cent and bath towels 76 per cent. Oral penicillin increased 18 per cent.

No wonder hospitals have to hike room service costs. No wonder the Blue Cross-Blue Shield is asking for additional monies.

But behind most of the increases is that bugaboo known as malpractice insurance. It is driving doctors out of the profession, and as shown above it is making things very precarious for hospitals.

These are just a few of the reasons why folks should write letters to their representatives in Lansing. The matter of malpractice insurance costs must be settled quickly before the situation gets more acute.

Local zoning laws meet new challenges in court

The right of individual cities, villages and townships to determine themselves the kinds of communities they wish to be is very deeply embedded into our American tradition of local self-government.

The right is expressed in a number of ways. Certainly local control of zoning and land use is the most important, followed by local voting of school millage.

And it is a right that makes a difference. Over the years, it has made a Bloomfield Hills different from a Farmington, a Plymouth different from a Redford Township.

And it is a right—at least as it has been used in the suburbs—that is coming under increasing challenge, particularly from the courts.

LOCAL ORDINANCES requiring large lots for houses or banning apartment buildings and mobile homes have been the subject of discrimination suits in federal and state courts. Opponents argue that such ordinances effectively exclude poor people, blacks, and other minorities from the suburbs.

A case now pending before the U.S. Supreme Court poses the unexpected question of whether people who do not even live in a community can force it to change its zoning rules. The case involves the black residents of Rochester, N.Y., who are challenging the zoning ordinances of the nearby suburb of Penfield.

In another decision, the New Jersey Supreme Court ruled last week that all communities in the state must provide a fair share of the low and moderate-income housing needed in their region. The court struck down the zoning regulations of suburban Mount Laurel, and appeal is unlikely since the court based its ruling on state constitutional guarantees.

Petaluma, a community 35 miles north of San Francisco, passed an ordinance limiting to 500 the number of new homes that could be built annually within the city limits, only to find it declared unconstitutional by a federal district court on the grounds that the restrictive ordinance violated the constitutionally-protected right of free travel.

OBVIOUSLY, these cases rub a raw nerve in the suburbs.

Zoning has always been one of the gut political issues in these communities. A former mayor of Livonia built his political success for many years on his firm pledge to stop apartment building in the city. The hearings over zoning for the proposed giant shopping center in northwestern Farmington Hills were traumatic for the entire community.

The emotions aroused by zoning run all the way from simple bigotry ("I don't want any blacks living next to my house") to preserving property values ("Why should I let the value of my house collapse when they put up tacky-tacky next door?").

AT THE HEART of the issue, moreover, is one of the deepest of human instincts: territoriality. We don't like other folks to mess with our turf, whether we live in Birmingham or Garden City.

What is really going on in those developments (aside from the fascination certain judges have with the equal protection clauses of the Constitution) is that the cities of this country are breaking down. They are no longer providing the

neighborhoods, education and security which poor or minority or just ordinary families need for stable development.

And since the big cities can't provide these requirements, the pressure is on the suburbs.

To say they will resist is to make one of the understatements of the year.

The miraculous 11-cent drop

The kids have a great expression to describe someone taking advantage of you or stealing from you. They say the person is "ripping you off."

We hear continually from Washington that we have an energy shortage and we must cut our consumption of gasoline and oil so that the country can import less of it from the Arab world.

On the other hand, we drive down the street and see some oil companies discounting prices so they can sell more of their products, which has to make people wonder about the shortage of the product.

But that's not where the ripping off comes in.

LAST WEEK I wrote about the fun and mobility of traveling to Florida in a motor home.

We took such a trip and kept accurate records of everything including how much gas we bought, for how much, where.

The motor home got 7.83 miles a gallon and had a 40 gallon tank, so our stops at gas stations were frequent and financially impressive.

We paid from a low of 47.9 cents to a high of 59.9 cents per gallon. It averaged 52.5 cents per gallon.

WHAT WAS DISTURBING was when we purchased gas at the high of 59.9 cents at a Union 76 station, there was an Amoco station across the street advertising gas for 48.9 cents but it was closed for the evening.

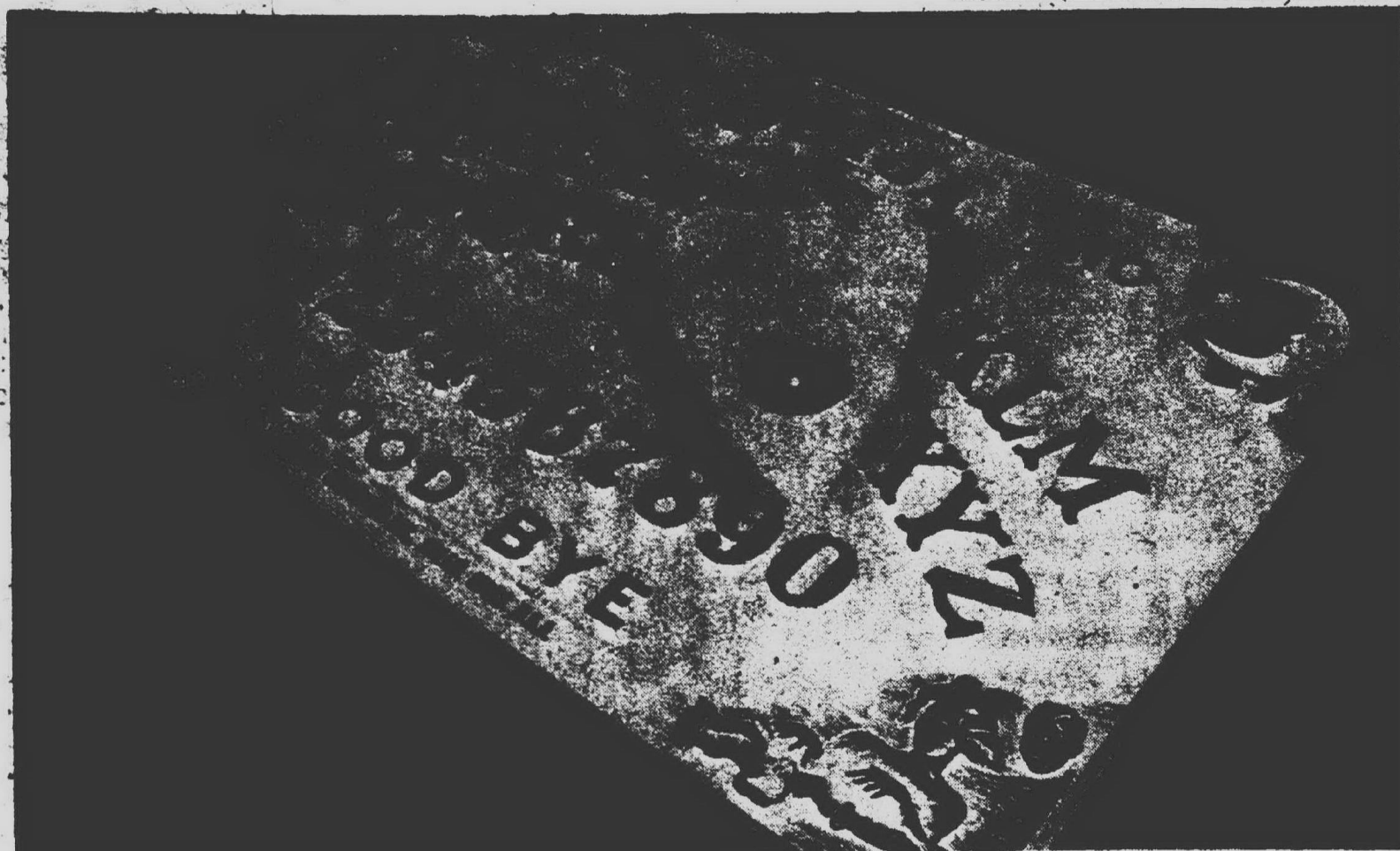

Subconscious often writes mysterious messages

Almost everyone is familiar with the Ouija board, a flat board about 18 by 12 inches with the alphabet and the words "yes," "no" and "good-bye" printed on it. The name "Ouija" comes from the French and German words "oui" and "ja" meaning yes.

A planchette is a small wooden instrument, usually triangular or heart-shaped, mounted on ball-bearing casters and very much like the pointer used with the Ouija board. The pointer itself is sometimes called a planchette. The major difference is that a pencil or ballpoint pen is inserted in the planchette so that it writes messages instead of just pointing out letters.

I PREFER the planchette over the Ouija board for two reasons.

An Ouija board is made to be used by two players. I've never been able to be sure the other player wasn't pushing the board and influencing the message, and I'm sure that at times they must have had the same doubts about me.

Then, too, the pointer often moves very fast, and human memory being what it is, the message may not always be recalled accurately later when you are trying to analyze it.

The planchette is used by only one person. If it moves, either you or some outside force is pushing it; with it, you have a written record of the message.

WHETHER OR NOT you believe the messages, there is no disputing the fact that they are received. The questions are: Received from whom? or from what? or from where?

Are you subconsciously controlling the planchette without knowing it? Are these messages really from deep within your mind, perhaps made up of knowledge gleaned by your clairvoyance and revealed to you through automatic writing?

Or is the instrument being pushed by other forces, and the messages the words of other entities, spirits dwelling on another plane?

One of my students, a gentle old man in his 70s, insisted that the writing his planchette produced was the work of a ghost. When I asked him how he could be so certain, he answered, "All it ever writes is dirty words, and I don't talk that way!"

I really don't believe that particular old man ever did say a dirty word in his whole life, but I'm sure he knew what they meant and had at least thought them a few times. This was a way for his subconscious to express these thoughts and blame it on some lecherous old ghosts.

One lady misplaced a set of valuable rings, and her neighbor was able to find them for her through the use of her planchette. Did this come to her through clairvoyance, or with the aid of a spirit guide? Who can be sure?

I DON'T BELIEVE in paging ghosts, but if you feel a spirit has been trying to contact you, perhaps you can help it by sitting in the haunted area with a planchette.

Some people claim to receive such inspired writing with nothing more than a pen held in the hand they do not ordinarily write with. Others have typed out whole manuscripts.

One woman writes scores for musical compositions which she believes are given to her by Liszt, Mozart and other composers long dead.



Many things people write in this way are pure fantasy, much like dreams. They should be accepted as such and be interpreted in the same way as dreams your mind creates while you are sleeping.

In any case, if you decide to try your hand at automatic or spirit writing, do it with an open mind and analyze your writings carefully.

Do not be disheartened if at first you receive only illegible scribbles. It often takes many writings before you receive easily deciphered messages. The handwriting will not resemble your own. If you are using a planchette, your i's will not be dotted and your t's seldom crossed.

Defending champs must rebuild

Churchill finds baseball ranks thin

The Livonia Churchill baseball team is definitely not as good as it was a year ago.

And a good thing, because if the Chargers had made any improve-

ments over last year's 24-2 state Class A championship squad, the Michigan High School Athletic Association might make them move their show to the corner of Michigan and Trumbull.

"Of course I was more optimistic then, than this year. Last year I felt that we would win our league title and make a run in the tournament," said Churchill coach Roger Frayer.

Frayer was standing in the crowded gymnasium at the Livonia school watching sophomore pitcher-outfielder Bill Bardwell have no particular luck throwing curveballs at various brave souls during a bunting drill.

"Of course that was an exceptional team last year," he continued.

EXCEPTIONAL IT WAS. The Chargers marched all the way to the state title, the first of a team variety in Livonia's history. His team smashed Hazel Park 10-1 in the state finals.

But 11 players including seven starters have departed via graduation. A measure of the worth of those players can be found in the fact that seven are now playing college baseball and one has made the professional ranks.

So Frayer is faced with the task of rebuilding. And the ranks are thin.

Hardest hit was the pitching corps where Dan Panzoff (10-0), Kevin Nelson (8-1) and Andy Coppola (5-0) have departed. Only Warren Wallis and Dan Bobowski return. That pair had a combined 7-1 record last season.

Other pitching help is looked for from converted outfielder Kurt Pitcher, who at 6-2, 218 pounds was a stand-out defensive end for the Churchill grid team last season and sophomores Hardwell and Dave Schomber.

B.J. LaJoie and Ronnie Griffith form an exceptional double play combination and catching is no problem as long as Jay Nelson avoids injury. Sophomore Mark Galasso shows promise in the outfield, but beyond that, times are tough.

"OVERALL THIS CLUB is not as fast as last year's. I would have to say that we will be an underdog in our league," Frayer said realistically.

The team to which Churchill will be an underdog is Plymouth Canton. The Chiefs have everyone back from last year and should rule the Western Six.

"But this is a great baseball league," Frayer said. "Everyone talks about how good the Suburban Eight is athletically, but in the four years that this state's had a baseball tournament, we've had one state champ and two runners-up from this league. That's not bad."

While Frayer realizes the competition will be tough, he's far from being down on his own team.

"This is a hard working team and

the fact that we are experienced winners will help us. No one has ever repeated as state champions, but it would be nice to repeat," he said.

The Livonia Churchill baseball

team, indeed is not as good as it was last year. But Frayer put it best.

"We're still the state champions until they take our title away on the field."

New AAU directors lays down goals

Dr. Dennis Sprandel doesn't want to topple over the apple cart, although he would like to rearrange a few of the apples.

Sprandel, who earned a doctorate degree from Michigan State University in athletic administration, was appointed executive director of the Michigan Amateur Athletic Union (MAAU) earlier this year. He replaced the outgoing director Sidney Fox.

The MAAU began in 1923. Today, the group registers amateur athletes, conducts and sanctions amateur athletic events.

SPRANDEL, A former professor at MSU's evening school, is unique in that he is the first graduate of athletic administration to head the Michigan group and one of a few such grads across the country to work with the AAU.

"Athletic administration in college is just beginning in this country," Sprandel said in an interview earlier this week from his rather modest Detroit office. "Canada is much farther advanced than us in this field."

Athletic administration in United States colleges is a product of the late sixties. Ohio University was one of the first institutions to offer the curriculum and it also had the distinction of gaining some poor publicity.

Published reports indicated that graduates of the program experienced trouble landing jobs or performing in the ranks of professional sports management.

"WHAT WE have is many disappointed people running ticket offices," Sprandel said. "Although I do have the experience much of my work was at the theoretical level. The AAU will be a good testing ground for many of the ivory tower theories I've been writing about."

In addition to his formal education credentials, Sprandel played baseball at Albion College and managed amateur baseball while teaching at the University of Arizona.

An estimated 200 clubs are affiliated with the MAAU which are spread into 22 sports while more than half the MAAU registrations belong to swimming.

Sprandel, 33, listed an energetic series of goals he hopes to see the Michigan AAU realize. While emphasizing he is not a about to tear down what the MAAU has built up, Sprandel did say he would like to institute some "basic management principles" in his office, which incidentally serves the entire state.

"I REALIZE some people might be skeptical of a professor sitting behind this desk, but my predecessor was a public relations man and a very good one," Sprandel said. "My background is in administration."

A policy making Board of Managers governs the MAAU. The 16-man group is allowed 15 votes — one each — with one emeritus position. Sprandel does not vote and a Board of Governors, comprised of persons from each sport, represents the state group at the national level.

The MAAU exceeded its estimated \$59,000 budget for fiscal 1974 by \$6,000 and one of Sprandel's top priorities is to get the group out of the red. The non-profit organization draws its revenues from percentages of individual member registration fees and club dues and 10 per cent of entry fees for special events.

"We can't keep operating on a shoestring," the recently appointed executive director said. "We do need money."

SPRANDEL FELT that the future of the MAAU was limited only by the Michigan population.

"Because money is drying up, many high schools are dropping some sports," he said. "The AAU is the logical choice. It is more than just a group which sends athletes to the Olympics. Amateur athletics offers a chance to compete and have fun. After all, athletics is fun and I think you

are going to see this 'play for fun' idea increase in Michigan."

Sprandel, a native of Little Falls, Minn., also sees a resource outside the Metropolitan Detroit area.

"We are small fish in Detroit because we have to compete with the professional teams in the city for publicity. I'm very much in favor of visibility for the AAU throughout the state."

Although MAAU reports listed individual membership at 15,000, Sprandel thought the number was closer to 11,000. He added that he hopes to double both the individual and club memberships.

"THERE ARE many opportunities in the media we have not tapped," he said. "What I see is a skeleton of an organization. I feel my job should lend expertise to the volunteer field workers — that's where MAAU leadership comes from."

The professional athletic administrator noted there are 22 different state championships sponsored by the MAAU which take place with little community interest or knowledge.

"We have to put muscle into our program and monitor it," Sprandel said.

In recent years, the AAU has often surfaced publicly in controversies with the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) over sending athletes to the Olympics or World Games. Sprandel flatly called the notion that the two amateur athletic groups do not get along "unfounded."

"THE CONTROVERSY with the AAU and NCAA is false," he said. "We often depend on NCAA members for use of their facilities during AAU events. Oh, there might be some difference of opinion during the Olympics, but the purpose of both groups is to help amateur athletes."

With the MAAU, Sprandel hopes some old fashion organizational techniques, applied through the relatively new field of trained athletic administrators, can put the state's AAU into high gear.

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Turf Tips, Quips

Believe it or not and despite all of the growling about the 1975 dates, Northville Downs just completed its most successful season in 32 years with 82 nights during the winter.

Perhaps the unusual success proves Northville Downs Executive Director John Carlo's contention that winter dates are the best if the plant has the proper facilities and location.

There isn't any question that Northville has the facilities but the location is anything but the best and will remain such until the new network of super highways is completed. Then it is our belief Carlo will bid for the winter dates instead of fighting them.

THE 'DOWNS rang down the curtain on its 32nd season Tuesday with all-time betting and attendance records. Inasmuch as that is the criteria for the success or failure of a meeting, then it must be said that business was booming as never before.

For instance, the former mark for a single night's wagering was \$608,000,

set back in the summer of 1971. This year that figure was bettered several times with a high of \$678,033 on Saturday, March 29.

There was a time not so many years ago when Carlo and his partners were on cloud nine when the handle soared over \$500,000. None had ever thought it would reach that level.

Then just last Saturday there were high hopes the half-mile track would reach the \$700,000 barrier for the first time. Only a fat payoff in a trifecta and a couple of longshots killed those hopes. As it was, wagering totaled \$675,595.

FOR THOSE who are interested, and we sometimes wonder if the average racegoer cares that much about statistics, here are the revised statistics at Northville.

Most wagered on a Monday, 4/7—\$594,868; Tuesday, 4/1—\$431,704; Thursday, 3/27—\$510,432; Friday, 4/4—\$616,701; and Saturday, 3/29—\$678,033.

Then there was the largest nightly double pool of \$60,674 on April 5 and

the largest single race pool on the seventh race on April 5 with \$97,588.

Just think—\$97,588 on a single race in the 32nd season when the total handle for an eight race program was often \$20,000 and less back in the first year of operation in 1944. That's how much harness racing has improved in Michigan.

John Konesky, III, the third generation of Koneskys to race at Northville Downs, captured the driving championship with a winning percentage of .407. The Pemberville, O. native finished well ahead of second place Tom Harmer.

Slender Ted Smith, of Mason, was the winningest driver with a total of 36 firsts in 153 starts. Each was awarded a trophy by Cecil Ward, a super harness racing enthusiast who operates a trophy dispensing outfit in Detroit.

THE DETROIT RACING Association staged its first Sunday program and appeared very satisfied with the turnout of more than 12,000 and a handle of slightly more than \$1.1 million. Naturally the mutual clerks' union wasn't entirely happy since members would have received double time if the wagering had reached \$1.2 million.

Vice President and General Manager Dick Wilson was pleased with the turnout and is looking forward to even bigger and better Sunday turnouts as the days get warmer.

Meanwhile, the DRC is making plans for its annual Old Times Day on Saturday, April 19 when the prices will be turned away back, admission to the grandstand reduced and youngsters under 12 admitted free when accompanied by an adult.

It will be the only time of the DRC meeting that kids 12 and under will be admitted. Seems Racing Commissioner Leo Shirley frowns on kids at the track, and rightfully so, and has allowed each of the tracks one day for the kids. Other than that they'll be barred from the premises.

Getting back to Good Old Times, there'll be dime hot dogs, and prices of five cents for pop, popcorn and ice cream.

Admission to the grandstand will be 50 cents and the management is planning a number of Old Time events for the afternoon. It should be an interesting afternoon for all and especially for the kids who'll be able to eat until they burst on the dime hot dogs.

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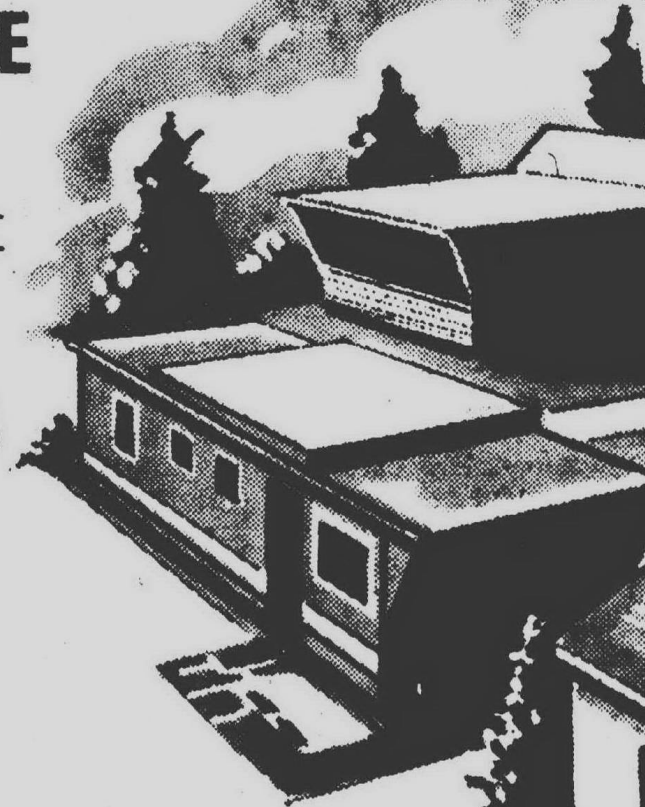
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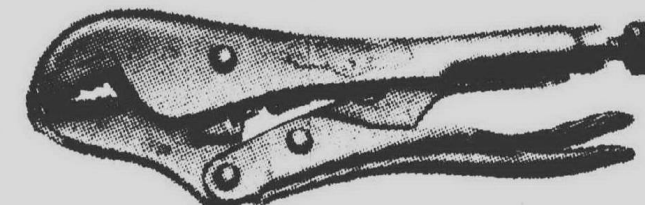
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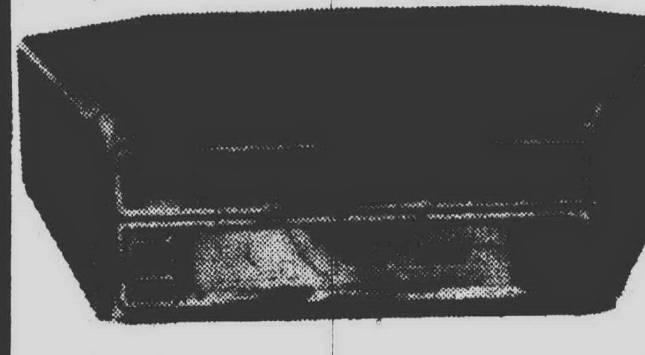

Now that spring planting is just around the corner, don't forget cucumbers. We have some cucumbers that can be grown in pots or tubs, and which can be trained to grow on trellises or strings, taking up very little space around the house.

If you own a greenhouse and want to grow cucumbers, use those varieties bred for greenhouse production only, not for outdoors. The European or Greenhouse cucumbers cannot be grown outside as they are seedless and self-pollinating. Any additional pollinating from bees, insects or wind would cause seed pods to form in the cucumber and make it gourd-like and unusable. Make sure you order the right kind of cuke seed.

THERE ARE several "all-female" cucumbers available for the home gardener. Princess, one of the hybrids, is early (60 days) and has an all-female parent. A few male seeds are enclosed with females for higher yields. Usually the all-female vines start to bear very early and some of the fruits are crooked and misshapen. The normal cukes are slender and fairly long, greenish in color and great to eat.

If you're one of those who can't eat cucumbers because they "talk back," to you, try the Burpless 26, a Japanese hybrid, long, slim and curved. The skin is so tender you don't have to peel it before eating. Marketmore 70 is a very dependable producer, carrying resistance to scab and mosaic diseases. Victory is an all America winner, ripening in 50 days, probably the earliest slicing cucumber.

GREEN THUMB CLINIC: "We have some nut trees which seldom

bear nuts. We heard that if you beat the bark with a ball bat, it will make the trees bear. Is this true?"

Answer: Whacking the trunk of a tree or driving nails into it have little to do with making it bear. Iron has nothing to do with bearing of nuts. Often it is the age of the tree; some varieties bear earlier than others. For example: McIntosh apple trees start bearing at the age of six or seven, while golden delicious begins to fruit at four to six years.

Weather at pollinating time can affect bearing. Bees are lazy in bad weather and don't work on the blossoms.

Sometimes a spring frost will kill the blossoms, preventing set of nuts and fruit. Sometimes whacking the trunk might act like ringing the bark does, but it's not worth the effort.

Morton Puner. "What We Know About Growing Old." We are now in the midst of one of the quietest and most fruitful revolutions in history; the conquest of age as man has known and feared it. Today's middle aged will reap its benefits—their old age will possess a life style and pleasures unknown to the old in the past. And the next generation may see the prolongation of its years—not the senescent ones but another thirty or more of the vigorous, good years of mid-life. That is the promise of "To the Good Long Life," based upon the latest findings of gerontology and the realities of a world in which the old are growing rapidly in numbers and significance.

It tells what governments and institutions are doing for the old, and the role of old age and nursing homes, day care and "senior citizens" centers. 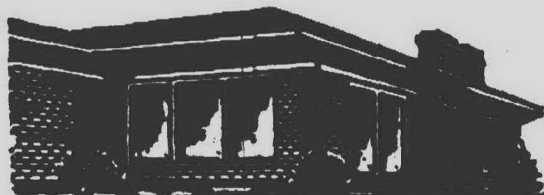

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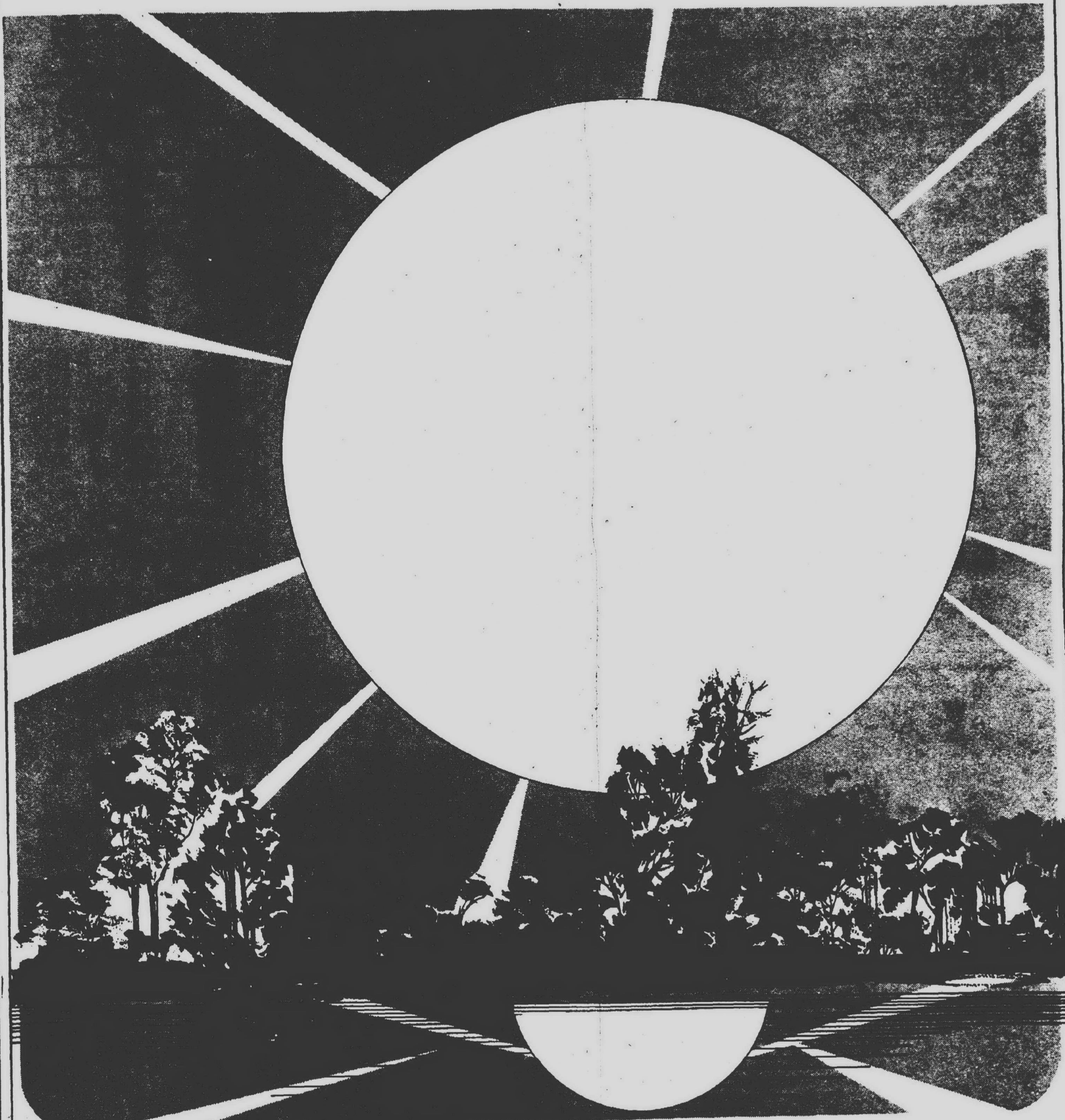
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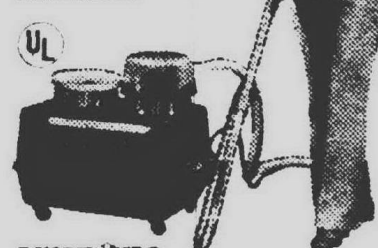
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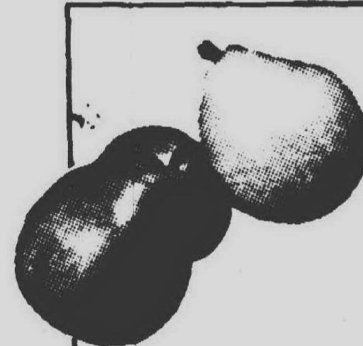
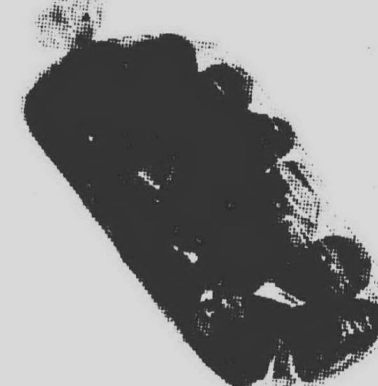


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5 earn Merit scholarships

Five area residents are among the 1,300 high school seniors nationwide named as winners of corporate-sponsored four-year National Merit Scholarships.

The scholarships are financed by more than 280 corporations, founda-

tions, professional associations, unions and trusts.

Area winners include Susan P. Baisch, Lynne Nicolau, and Mary E. Wojtan of Livonia, Philip D. Schulte of Plymouth, and Mary H. Seaberg of Westland.

THIS IS THE FIRST of three groups of merit scholars to be named in the 20th annual nationwide competition, administered by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) of Evanston, Ill.

In 1975, more than 3,700 seniors will win Merit Scholarships valued at more than \$8 million.

Each of the corporate-sponsored scholarship winners will receive between \$1,000 and \$6,000 over four years of college. The majority of corporate-sponsored scholarships are for children of company employees or who reside in areas or communities where the sponsoring company has plants or operations.

A few are designated finalists because they plan to pursue particular fields of study and careers the sponsor wishes to encourage.

The annual stipend for a corporate-sponsored four-year scholarship is determined on an individual basis, but is generally between \$250 to \$1,500 per year. The amount is meant to provide the difference between the cost of attending college and the amount the family can be expected to provide for yearly college expenses.

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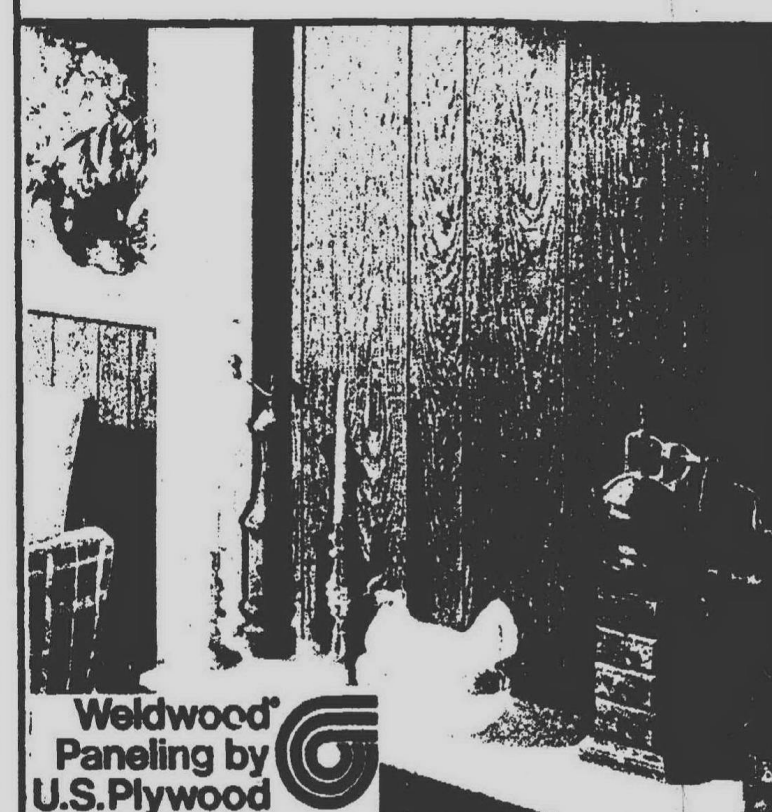
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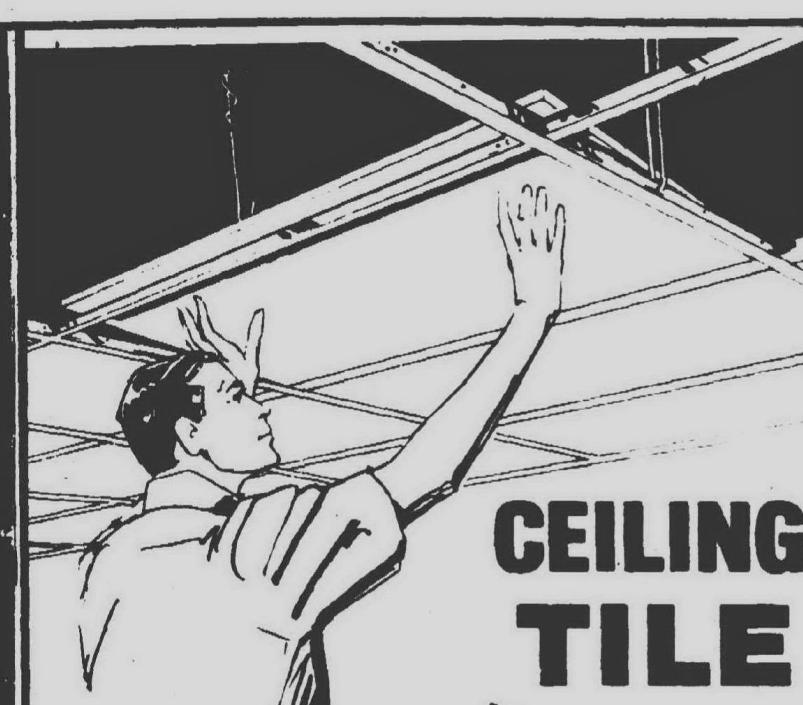
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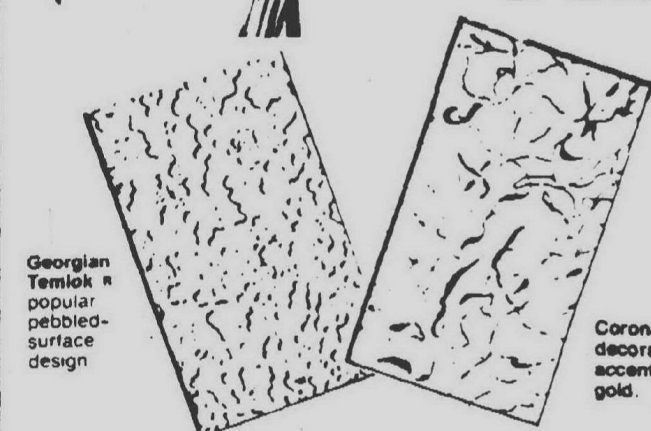
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Greenfield Village welcomes spring Orchestra offers cabaret concert

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Mayor aids theater's search for permanent home

The Wayne-Westland Civic Theater (WWCT) soon may receive permanent headquarters if the City of Westland's application for community development funds is approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and if Westland Mayor Eugene McKinney's budget for fiscal year 1976 is approved by the city council.

That's a lot of ifs, but according to WWCT President Al La Croix of Plymouth, it's more encouraging than the group's present situation.

The WWCT, currently stages its plays in John Glenn High School Auditorium or St. John Episcopal Church, both in Westland. It's become increas-

ingly difficult, however, to meet expenses after paying rent and maintenance fees, says La Croix.

THE WWCT thought it had the problem solved when it petitioned the City of Wayne last fall for use of the vacant Wayne Recreation Building on Michigan Avenue, east of Wayne Road.

With help from the Michigan Council for the Arts (MCA), the theater group presented renovation plans and budget proposals to the Wayne City Council.

"We've been put off, laid aside and postponed because the city (Wayne) can't decide what to do with the building," says La Croix.

The WWCT was supposed to have

had a decision by March, he adds.

McKinney's proposal for the WWCT is part of the community centers project for Westland, in which available buildings in the north and south sections of the city would be used for community recreation. Originally named senior citizen centers, McKinney says they would be drop-in spots for all ages, and available for many different activities.

THE BUDGET for 1976 takes the first effective step toward providing funds to supplement community development dollars to open these centers, outlines McKinney.

The centers would include the old Cooper Elementary School at Middle Belt and Ann Arbor Trail, and the present recreation center on Dorsey. The recreation administrative offices would be moved into the present police station which will be vacant when a new station is completed.

McKinney says additional funds are allocated to effect the move into the new police station this fall. The two

centers and the multi-purpose arena will provide three facilities within a reasonable distance for all Westlanders to enjoy.

The city already has approached the Livonia School District on leasing the vacated Cooper School, adds McKinney.

"I'm not saying either of these buildings would be given to the theater exclusively, but they would be offered use of the building," explains McKinney. "It could be either building, depending on renovation plans and which one is most suitable."

Funds for maintaining the community centers have been included in the mayor's budget, which must be approved by the city council by June 1. The community development dollars can not be used to operate these centers says McKinney.

La CROIX feels McKinney's proposal is a "fantastic idea." "We've done so many indepth studies of stage reconstruction, temporary seating and lighting, that we could renovate any-

thing," says La Croix.

The permanent facility also would be a financial boost to the theater group explains La Croix.

"We're a non-profit organization in the strictest sense of the word." The WWCT pays \$1,000 to rent auditorium and storage space for a production.

The cost just about drains the thea-

ter's reserves and limits what shows the theater can present.

Scheduling also has become a problem. In a rented facility such as John Glenn the theater group has had to cut back productions because of a clash with the school's play schedule.

The WWCT which began in 1959 as an adult education theater class, presently has 60 members.

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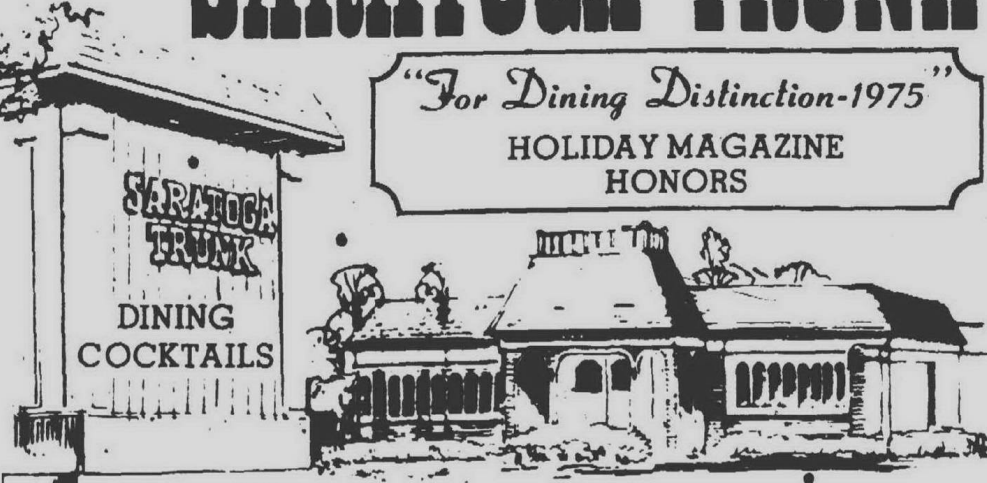
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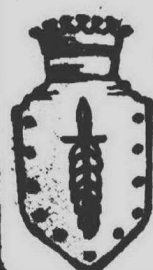
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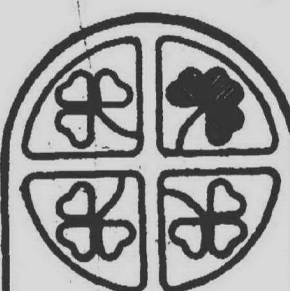

Video tape records local history

It looks as though realtor Harry S. Wolfe might be on his way to becoming Livonia's newest TV idol.

A resident of the area for 74 years, Wolfe is currently "starring" in a half hour videotape on the history of Livonia.

Called "Discovering Our Roots — A Folk History," the film is currently under production under the sponsorship of the Livonia Historical Commission with the cooperation of the Livonia Public Schools.

Chief catalyst in the effort is a young film-maker named Jim King, a former student of Bentley High School. Possibly it was all the talk about the bicentennial year that turned his thoughts backward to Livonia's past.

It was also the recent death of former mayor Jesse Ziegler that made him aware that the city had a past, and that few were aware of it.

"LIVONIA HAS CHANGED so fast in recent years that people aren't aware of our heritage," King said. "A lot of families and young couples move in here and don't know that the city has a rich history. It wasn't always parking lots and shopping centers."

Deciding that oral history, making use of long-time residents of the area,

would be the way to go, King approached the Livonia Historical Commission with the idea of making videotapes.

He told them the project could be done cheaply by using the resources already available in the community. The commissioners gave him a nod for a pilot videotape.

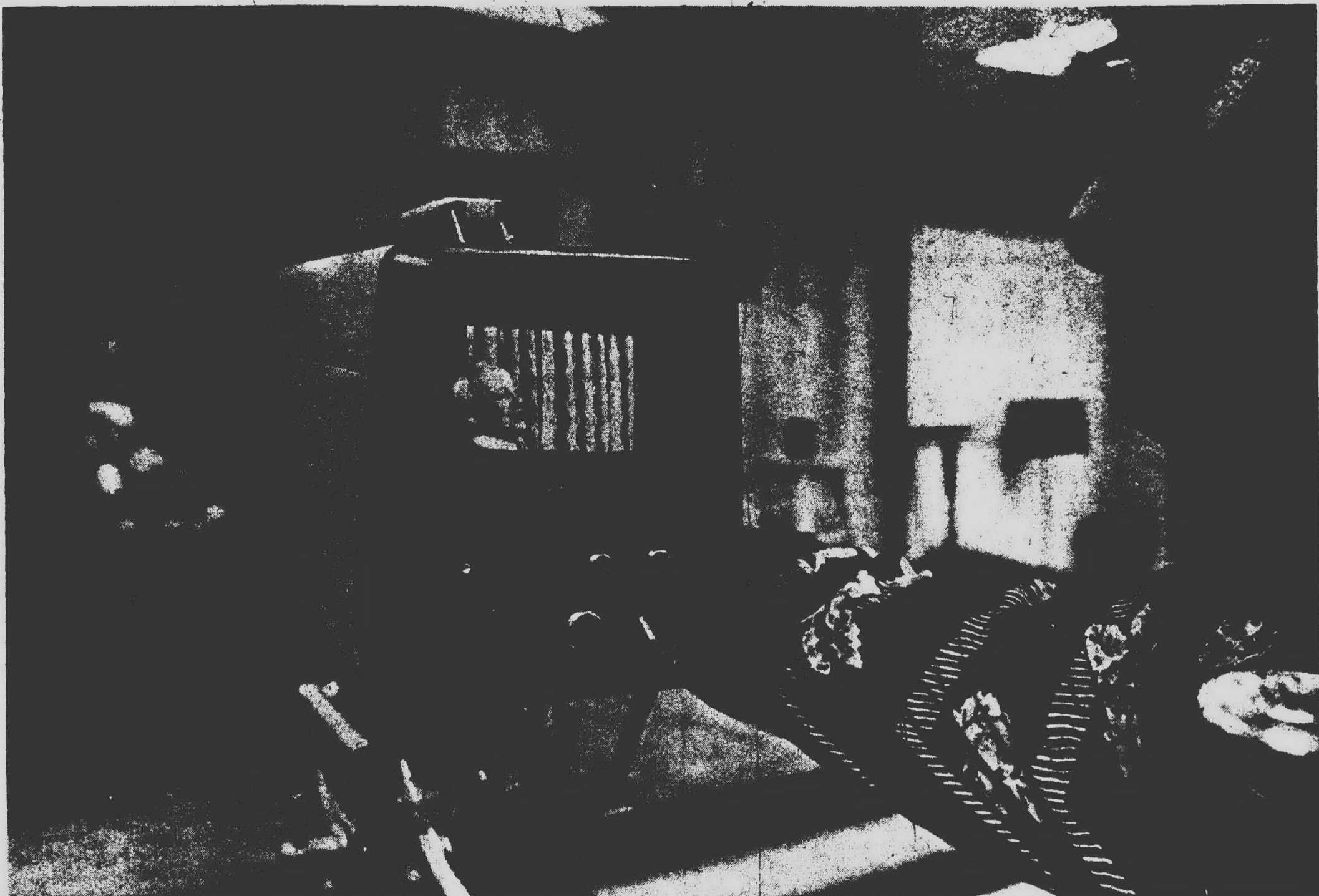
WE TAKE YOU NOW to a room in Franklin High School, where an informal run-through of the proposed videotape is about to take place.

Bustling around preparing Franklin's television equipment for shooting is Hal Waller, teacher of a course on techniques of radio and TV production. He is going to direct the endeavor.

His students are all at their stations. Wearing headphones, Todd Mapes of Westland, is preparing one camera, while Glenn Frazier readies another.

In the control room, Erich Phillips is fiddling with the audio equipment. Kathy Delinger and George Spires are checking two slide projectors, which will introduce still photographs on Livonia's past onto the tape.

OFF TO ONE SIDE King is telling Harry Wolfe about production matters. He explains that Wolfe is to sit in a rocking chair in front of a homey-looking set, previously used by

Franklin students in their production of "Music Man."

King will sit next to Wolfe on a stool to do the interviewing.

Purposefully moving around and between and over the wires and equipment is Tom Dyke, King's mentor, whose company makes educational films, documentaries and commercials.

Now comes the time when the cameras are all focused, Wolfe and King are wired for sound and the sequence of the taping is arranged.

"Quiet in the studio!" calls Waller from the control room. "Hang loose," he adds, addressing his youthful technicians.

AS ONE OF HIS EARLIEST memories of Livonia, Wolfe recalled the building of a barn on the 100-acre farm his parents bought in 1901 in the area where Seven Mile and Farmington roads intersect.

"We had a barn-raising and the neighbors came over to put up the

rafters," he said. "I think the carpenter must have had all the work planned in advance. I expect there was also a big meal prepared."

Wolfe's parents used to have boys come out from Detroit during the summer to help with the gardening and other chores.

"Sometimes at lunchtime we all played ball," he said.

WOLFE BELIEVES that the automobile was the invention that brought the greatest changes to the quiet rural life he first lived in Livonia.

"I was probably eight or 10 when I first saw a car," he explained. "I thought it was great."

Entertainment in those days was produced by the people in the area themselves at school and churches. However, there were a few exceptions, such as the yearly trip to visit Belle Isle.

"The depression was really rough," Wolfe recalled. "Anyone who calls this a depression, or even a recession, has never experienced a real depression. Hundred of people lost their property."

Of great importance to the development of Livonia, was the passage of the first zoning and building regulations in 1942, Wolfe said.

As a result of these and subsequent regulations, Wolfe declared "I think the city will continue to have a healthy growth and will be a good place to live." "Cut."

THIS BRIDAL PAIR are made of wet mop, broom, dust mop and dust pan, and they've become Mrs. McDonald's own special shower gift.

"The first time I made them I was short of money for a shower gift and decided to try something different," she said. For her sister's wedding, she fashioned the bride from a wet mop and broom, putting a tiara and veil atop the mop and encasing the broom straws in ruffled crepe paper and ribbon.

The bridegroom, already provided with dry mop hair, needed only a black crepe paper tuxedo and boutonniere.

THE ORIGINAL GIFT made quite a hit, so Mrs. McDonald has done a repeat performance at a couple of other weddings.

Be aware of additives, but don't be uptight

"I'm not uptight about additives," says Livonia nutritionist Irene Cameron.

"They have helped make it possible for the people of this country to have the best choice of foods ever in history made available."

"And in the Food and Drug Administration we have an agency that can and does keep a very close watch on our food supply. Foods themselves contain chemicals, and everything we eat could be harmful if used in excess."

"The important thing is to understand the use of these supplements and to be aware of how they are present in our diets."

Her view is shared by many top nutritionists, despite the often-publicized objections to certain additives and the recent emphasis on "natural" foods.

Additives are used, they point out, to preserve food, to supplement its nutritional value, to improve its flavor.

At the same time, those active in the nutrition field recognize that the whole matter of food additives is one that causes genuine concern to the homemaker who goes to the supermarket anxious to buy the best nutrition available.

DR. GILBERT LEVEILLE, chairman of the food science and human nutrition department of Michigan State University, put it this way in a recent Detroit visit:

"My concern is the feeling of fear on the part of the consumer about ad-

ditives. People get misleading information, and they don't know where to turn for the facts."

And Dr. William Darby, president of the Nutrition Foundation of New York, expressed at the same panel discussion the dilemma faced by the entire food industry in this matter.

"Our food supply," he said, "contains a great number of natural chemicals which, in the right amounts, could be considered poisons. But if we tried to avoid such natural toxins, we would impose self-made starvation on ourselves."

TWO EXAMPLES—calcium propionate in bread and nitrates and nitrites in meats—could help show the role of additives in food.

Calcium propionate retards mold in bread. Without it, shelf life of bread products would be so short that the baking industry would not be able to operate profitably and the convenience of buying a loaf of bread would be almost non-existent.

Nitrites and nitrates, according to an FDA bulletin, are natural compounds found in many foods as well as drinking water and human saliva.

They are used, the bulletin adds, in processing of meat and fish products, not only to keep the familiar red color but also to prevent the growth of bacteria that might cause botulism, a form of food poisoning that can be fatal.

"As with most products," the bulletin goes on, "nitrites and nitrates have risks as well as benefits. Under certain conditions, they can form chemicals called nitrosamines, which

experiments have shown can cause cancer in animals."

The FDA added that there is no evidence to indicate what effect nitrosamines have in humans, and also said the level of nitrites present in bacon samples is far lower than the level that would have to be present to cause cancer in experimental animals.

BUT THE STUDY indicates the kind of research that is constantly going on in the Food and Drug Administration as it serves as food-supply watchdog.

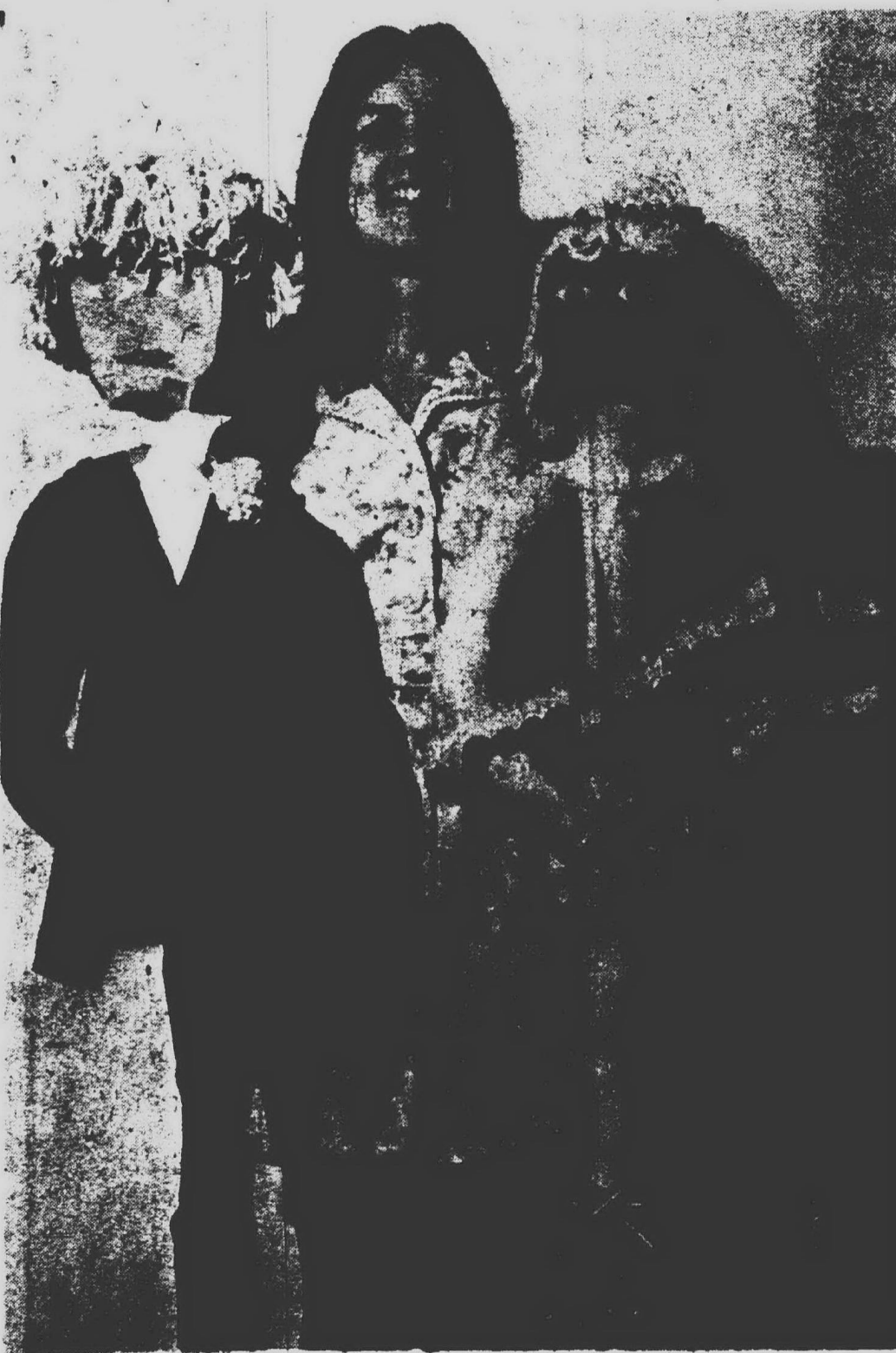
The commission functions under a basic food law passed in 1938 and amended in 1954 to regulate pesticides and in 1958 with regard to additives. Since the latter amendment, the FDA has compiled a GRAS list (of substances, like salt and sugar, that are Generally Regarded As Safe).

This list now contains some 600 items, and testing in the last few years has included such substances as cyclamates in soft drinks (taken off the market for a time but recently found to be not cancer-causing), saccharin (no conclusion yet) and additives suggested as possible contributors to hyperkinesis in children (also no conclusion).

THUS, THE CONSUMER should not worry excessively about food additives, nutritionists believe, but does have responsibilities in considering them when choosing what to put on the family table.

One of these is understanding food terms. Restoration means adding selected nutrients to restore nutrients lost through processing, for instance.

Continued from Page 1C and fortification is adding selected nutrients not normally present. Enrichment is adding nutrients to a food so as to make it conform to a special standard.

Several others are suggested by a home management educator, Margaret Nelson of the University of Wisconsin, writing in the MSU cooperative extension publication, Nutrition Viewpoint.

"Make a nutritious diet your goal, and don't be led astray by a fear of additives," Ms. Nelson recommends.

In this regard, she mentioned specifically being wary of fat diets, "organically grown" foods, which, she said, are not different in food value, and health foods, which may be more expensive and "probably no more nutritious than food available at any supermarket."

Ms. Nelson also suggested plenty of variety to the diet, because "it's more interesting, and you'll be less likely to consume an excessive amount of any one foodstuff or additive."

"READ THE LABELS," she continued. "They help you choose foods with nutritional additives."

"Select whole grain cereal products or choose enriched bread, rolls, cereals flour and pastas. Buy iodized salt, choose milk fortified with vitamin D, and avoid extreme consumption of highly-fortified foods, because too much of some vitamins may be harmful."

And finally, she recommended keeping informed and up-to-date, nutritionally speaking.

"Encourage public officials to maintain strong monitoring and testing programs for additives, and support legislation which strengthens such programs and provides adequate appropriations," she wrote. "Seek out dependable sources of information and aids to guide your choice and use of food."

"Then continue to enjoy eating."

Fund drive for CARIH to begin

A door-to-door collection drive will be launched April 15 by four area chapters of the Children's Asthma Research Institute and Hospital (CARIH).

Among the leaders of the March for Breath campaign, scheduled to continue through May 15, will be Mrs. Irv Medow of Livonia, president of the Elaine Levin chapter.

Funds raised will go to the National Asthma Center in Denver, where children from all over the country are treated and research on the disease continues.

Mrs. Medow and other members of the CARIH chapters gathered in Southfield recently to plan the fund drive and hear a report from Dr. Dudley Solomon, executive director of the center.

Dr. Solomon, who has a PhD in management and administration, told the local women that 37,242 days of free care, representing an expenditure of about \$1 million, have been provided at the center for Michigan children.

The center spends \$3.5-million a year, he reported, and said about half of that amount is raised in drives like the March for Breath.

Children at the center, he said, are recommended by physicians and are the ones who "can't be treated at home." They usually remain 12 to 18 months, he added, so medical personnel there can "see them through all seasons."

The hospital director also reported on a recent breakthrough in research on asthma, the evidence that Gamma Five, a fifth antibody, is produced in greater quantity by asthmatics than by those who do not have the disease.

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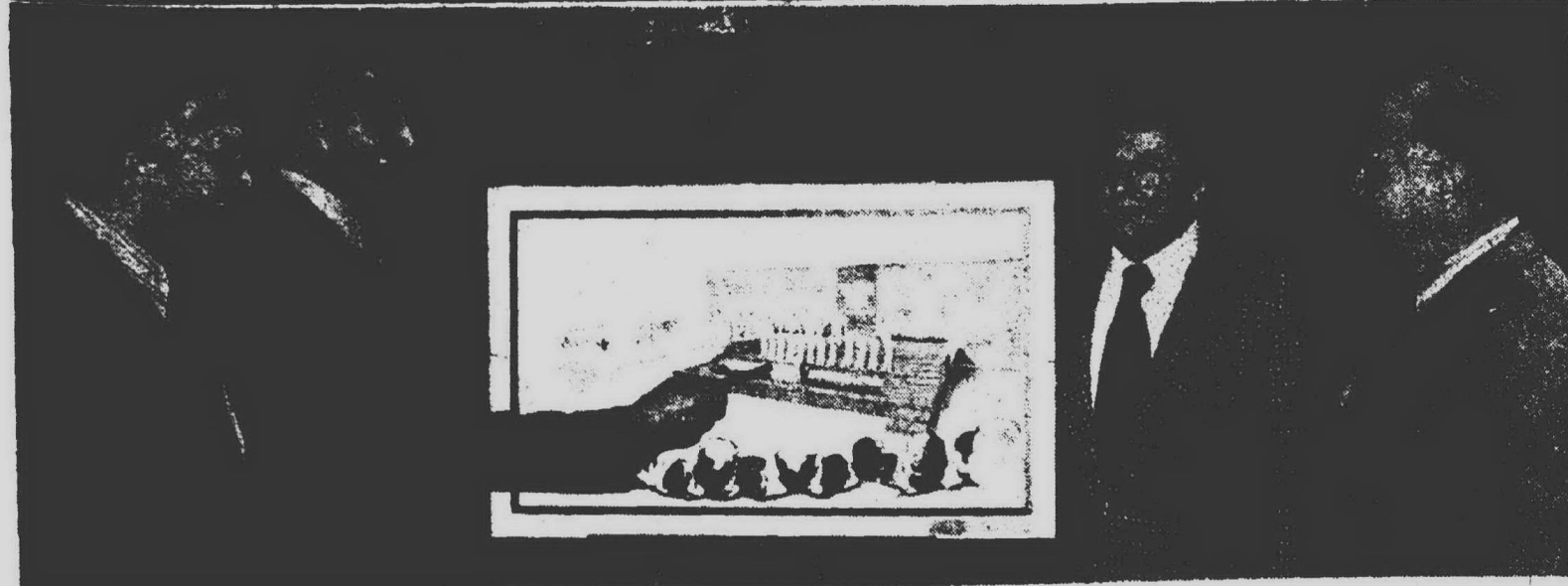
