Airport opposition grows

Opposition to the possible purchase and expansion of Mettetal Airport by Canton Township is growing.

The drive to prevent the township from buying the facility started seriously several weeks ago when residents from Pickwick Village and Farms subdivisions began circulating petitions and flyers.

That opposition has since spread to the city of Plymouth. "This is a city of homes," said Dr. Ralph Atchley of 480 Auburn Street. "That's what it says on the city seal. We don't care to have a large airport near the center of a city that is supposed to be a city of homes."

Atchley circulated a petition in the city and has already received 50 signatures. "I just don't believe the airport should be expanded. It will mean bigger planes landing there, more air traffic. It will increase noise, and in-

crease the hazard of crashes," commented the Plymouth resident.

HE ADDED. "Why are there all these feasibility studies? They had one in 1969 and this last one cost the taxpayer \$5,000. I can't see why they want another, especially when there are even more homes near the airport in Canton now."

Canton officials have been interested in the airport for several years and six months ago commissioned the consulting firm of R. Dixon Speas Associates to do a feasibility study. Cost of the analysis was \$10,000, and was split evenly between the township and the federal government.

The results of the report arrived about a month ago, and more copies were printed to allow concerned residents to read the results of the study.

A public hearing to discuss those re-

sults has been set for May 28, at 7:30 p.m. in the Plymouth-Canton High School auditorium.

"The airport may be an asset to the township," said clerk John Flodin. "We don't know. That's one of the reasons we have scheduled the hearing. One thing is certain, we should have a big turnout. That's why we have moved the hearing to the high school."

Township officials have been non-committal about the airport. "It's hard to make a determination about Mettetal right now," said Supervisor Robert Greenstein. "We have completely open minds about it. We'll wait for the public hearing. I hope we get a lot of input there—the more the better."

WHILE HOMEOWNERS have been busy circulating petitions, pilots and

businessmen who use the airport have been preparing for the hearing. Ken Spencer, a design executive at Ford Motor Company said, "The airport is an important part of the community. You'd be amazed how many times it keeps plants open with emergency runs."

He added, "Once the people lose this airport, they won't be able to get another. It is already integrated into the whole airspace network of the Detroit area. People don't realize it's almost impossible to get land zoned for airport use. If Mettetal goes, this community has lost it, it's gone."

Atchley, like other concerned homeowners commented, "I don't see why they can't use Willow Run. Why don't they get in their cars and drive over there. It's only 40 minutes away."

Ideas sought by committee for bicentennial celebration

"Government of the people, by the people, for the people shall not perish from the earth."

Those were words of Abraham Lincoln when he delivered his famous Gettysburg Address.

Although the words were uttered more than 100 years ago, they aptly reflect the spirit of the Community Bicentennial Commission and the country's 200-year history which it is trying to express.

The Community Bicentennial Commission, composed of representatives from local businesses, the Plymouth Community School District, the City of Plymouth and Plymouth and Canton townships, will meet next Wednesday, May 21, at 7:30 p.m. in West Middle School's multi-purpose room 44401 W. Ann Arbor Trail.

CHAIRPERSON Elizabeth Folger hopes all persons interested in the bicentennial will attend, so celebra-

tions will reflect efforts and ideas of and for all the people.

"I do feel the bicentennial should be something that each person in the community can identify with," Mrs. Folger said. The more involvement,



the better. I think it just makes good citizens."

Bicentennial commission members will relate plans already endorsed by the commission as well as those on the drawing board to new bicentennial participants at next week's meeting.

New members, Mrs. Folger said, will be asked to join one of three committees, organized under Michigan bicentennial guidelines:

- The heritage committee, chaired by Earl Gibson, to formulate projects focusing on the past.

- The festival committee, chaired by Frank Briggs, to organize bicentennial parades and festivals.

- The horizons committee, chaired by Brian Kidston, to outline bicentennial projects of a lasting nature or those focusing on the future.


"We're hoping these committees will grow to include as many as 200 people," Mrs. Folger said. "The com-

mittees will be the backbone of the bicentennial celebrations."

To further community involvement and interest in the bicentennial, Mrs. Folger and other commission members hope to open a bicentennial headquarters, where area residents can drop in to share ideas or perform an hour's work on a project.

Among projects already endorsed by the Community Bicentennial Commission are the publication of Sam Hudson's book, relating the history of Plymouth; the purchase of 1776 style uniforms for the Plymouth Fire and Drum Corps; a videotape of local history, produced by the American Association of University Women; and a taped oral history for the library.

The Community Bicentennial Commission, Mrs. Folger said, hopes to start a ledger of all bicentennial projects for coordination purposes.

Cooperative effort takes first steps

Recreation group to study needs

A new recreation authority has taken the first staggering steps toward unifying the recreational programs of four municipalities and a school district.

The new authority, composed of representatives from the Plymouth Community School District, the City of Plymouth and Plymouth, Canton and Superior townships, met for the first time last Wednesday to organize and exchange recreational ideas.

Although little action was taken, members outlined the recreational needs of the community the new authority could meet.

PLYMOUTH Township Trustee Gerald Burke volunteered to act as chairman of the new group, and Canton Township Trustee Brian Schwall volunteered for the secretary position.

Other members of the new authority are Plymouth City Commissioner Joseph Bida, Plymouth Community School Board Treasurer Tom Yack, and Kay Williams, secretary of Superior Township's Parks and Recreation Commission.

The intergovernmental council, which spearheaded attempts to resurrect last year's defunct recreation authority, has charged the new group with the implementation of a pilot recreation program and the investigation of a long-range plan.

The authority, as envisioned by intergovernmental representatives, will open all facilities and programs to the general public, regardless of city and township boundaries.

THE ALL-IMPORTANT question, "Where do we begin?" plagued members of the new authority at last week's meeting.

Plymouth Township Trustee Richard Gornick, a member of the intergovernmental council charged with organizing the new group suggested a possible starting point—a list of existing recreational facilities and recreational needs.

Members pointed to the city's Cultural Center and ice rink, Plymouth Township's recreational site and golf course near Ann Arbor Trail and McClumpha, Canton Township's re-

cently-purchased recreation site on Cherry Hill, the school district's facilities for arts and crafts classes and Superior Township's parks.

Burke noted the possible construction of a swimming pool on Plymouth Township's recreation site. The pool, if constructed, could be open to all community residents.

"OUR RECREATION advisory committee has talked about that," Burke said. "There's no 50-meter pool in the area now except at Schoolcraft College. No place has a 10-meter tower."

Added Bida, "I think that's the biggest need we have right now."

Ms. Williams noted the need for bicycle paths.

"If we work as a group, we could get paths that go somewhere," she said.

Bida pointed to a 43-acre well site, which the city owns on Beck Road. The site could be used as a rifle range, he said, or fishing holes or nature trails could be constructed.

School classrooms could be utilized for arts and crafts sessions during eve-

ning hours or summer months, Yack pointed out.

"All that money is tied up in facilities," Yack said, "and they're not being used to the utmost. That money is going to be harder and harder to get. I think we have to show the citizens that we're exploring every method to reduce costs."

TENNIS COURTS, an indoor track, an indoor rifle range, a multi-purpose recreational building and a recreational area for mini-bikes were among other needs authority members outlined.

"But we're talking big money," Schwall complained.

Gornick admitted, "We can't do all these things. This is just brainstorming. If you're going to suggest a pilot recreational program, you have to identify the community's needs."

The intergovernmental council, which spearheaded formation of the new group, has not ironed out plans for financial cooperation.


Members agreed to bring a list of their community's existing facilities to the next scheduled meeting on June 11. Burke agreed to bring a results of a survey, conducted in Plymouth Township, of residents' recreational wants.

The new organization is not the area's first recreation authority.

A PROPOSED recreational authority, that would have included the City of Plymouth, the Plymouth Community School District and Plymouth and Canton townships went awry in 1973, after the Plymouth City Commission opted out of the proposed contract.

"I think the city felt elected officials should have more rights on a committee like that," said Bida. "There was a feeling in the city that other groups were trying to take the Cultural Center away from us. It's a bonded issue, and we have to control it."

"We're interested in cooperation with everyone," Bida added. "This has got to be a new committee with positive thinking. Let's forget about what happened in the past."

Gerald Olson, of American Legion Post 391, will be parade marshal.

Other events during the Memorial Day ceremony will include the reciting of the pledge of allegiance, led by Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch

and Plymouth Township Supervisor, J. D. McLaren.

A wreath, honoring veterans who died in service of their country, will be laid by Cmdr. Bob Finnely of American Legion Post 391 and Cmdr. Gary Kubik, of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6695.

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1990 plan changed

Rapid rail in area still possible

The cause of rapid rail transit in the western Wayne County suburbs

gained a notch last week in southeastern Michigan regional councils. The Council on Regional Development (CORD) drew the C&O Railroad tracks which run between Schoolcraft and Plymouth roads into the proposed 1990 transportation plan of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. CORD is a subordinate unit of SEMCOG.

It was a modest victory for State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), whose 14th District includes Redford Township, Livonia and Plymouth; Schoolcraft College trustee Arch Vallier, a SEMCOG delegate; and Livonia Mayor Edward H. McNamara. All had protested the original version of the 1990 transportation plan because the Schoolcraft freeway was shown with only an express bus line rather than a rapid rail transit line.

TWO MORE steps must follow the CORD group's action before the plan is official.

First, the SEMCOG executive committee will devote a special meeting June 6 to the plan.

Second, the SEMCOG general assembly—in which all 100 member governments participate—will have the final decision at its June 26 quarterly meeting on the Mercy College campus in Detroit.

Purpose of the regional transportation plan is to give counties, local units, state and federal highway and transit authorities a guide for the forthcoming decades. Regional planning was first required under a 1964 federal aid law.

DAVID SHEPHERD, CORD chairman, said his group of political leaders and technical experts made some 70 modifications to the proposed 1990

plan, only a few of which could be called major.

In the western Wayne County case, he said, "We are adding all railroad lines presently carrying passengers, particularly the C&O Railroad as it goes through Redford, Livonia and Plymouth."

"We were responding to a considerable amount of local interest in having rail service out there," said Shepherd, who is also Oak Park mayor and a SEMCOG vice chairman.

Asked precisely how the CORD action improved the chances for rapid rail transit, Shepherd said it indicated "more thorough study should be made before anything is done out there. The study could show either that passenger rail is needed or it isn't."

The studying agency could be either SEMCOG, the state, the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority or some combination.

SEVERAL OTHER major modifications of the original 1990 plan were made by CORD.

M-59, a state highway which runs through the middle of Macomb, Oakland and Livingston counties, was downgraded in its Livingston sector. West of US-23 to I-96, the M-59 route is now shown as a freeway "corridor under study" rather than as a freeway corridor. East of US-23 to Pontiac, however, it will continue to have freeway corridor status, Shepherd said.

And the controversial Northwestern Highway freeway plan in West Bloomfield Township through the Oakland County lakes area was reduced also to "corridor under study" status, making the possibility of federal funds for construction more remote.

East of Inkster Road, however, Northwestern will continue to have freeway corridor status, and Shepherd said severe traffic problems make freeway status a necessity.

In the area around Metropolitan Airport, the Wayne County Road Commission lost its bid to win "regional major" status for three roads, including Middle Belt. An example of a regional major would be Eight Mile Road east of Grand River—divided, eight lanes, limited access and limited crossovers.

Legislators back Cowden

Ronald Cowden, incumbent Schoolcraft College trustee, has gained re-election endorsements from some area legislators.

Cowden, seeking re-election June 9, has received support from U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor), State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), State Rep. John Markes (D-Westland), and State Rep. Robert Geake (R-Northville).

The Schoolcraft district includes the Livonia, Plymouth, Garden City, Clarenceville and Northville school districts. Esch's district includes Livonia and Plymouth; Pursell's Livonia, Plymouth and Redford Township; Markes' Westland and part of Livonia; and Geake's Northville and part of Livonia.

Cowden stresses his concern for an ongoing re-evaluation of Schoolcraft's programs to keep them relevant to students' academic and vocational needs.

Cowden is especially supportive of the Wayne State-Schoolcraft consortium providing the college with use of the Wayne County Child Development Center and cooperative academic programs with WSU.

"The agreement will provide more facilities for Schoolcraft, and more academic and faculty resources for our students," says Cowden.

6 Mile, Cherry Hill will be widened

LANSING — Bids will be taken this month in Lansing by the Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation on projects to widen Six Mile in Livonia and Cherry Hill in Westland and Garden City.

The state plans to reconstruct and widen 1.6 miles of Six Mile at an estimated cost of \$2.1 million. The reconstruction and widening of two miles of Cherry Hill is expected to cost \$2.7 million.

The two miles of Cherry Hill will be widened from two to five lanes from Wayne Road east to Merriman. It is expected to be completed in October 1976.

Six Mile is to be widened from two to five lanes from 670 feet west of Levan Road east to 245 feet west of Farmington Road. Completion date is set at June 1976.

Bids for these and other projects in the state will be opened May 21.

The largest scheduled project, estimated at almost \$10 million, is to widen 2.2 miles of I-94 between US-23 and US-12 west of Ypsilanti and several related sub-projects.

Utility investigation hearing is Tuesday

A Special House Committee investigating the Michigan Public Service Commission's (MPSC) regulation of utility rates will hold its first public hearing Tuesday, May 20.

It will begin at 7 p.m. in Room 514 of the Veterans Memorial Building, 151 West Jefferson, Detroit. Committee chairman is State Rep. Howard Wolpe (D-Kalamazoo).

The hearing is being held at night to allow as much participation as possible by the general public.

Wolpe says a major purpose of the committee is to determine whether utility rates are being adequately regulated by the MPSC.

He said the committee hopes to hear from residents and businessmen in the area on how the recent large utility rate increases have affected them.

After the committee has heard from residents and businessmen, and from the utilities at special hearings planned next month, it plans to make an indepth investigation of the MPSC's regulation of utility rates, including policies and practices relating to the ratepaying public.

The committee is concerned with the allocation of expenses between the ratepayers and the stockholders and whether such allocation is justified.

Another area of inquiry is whether the MPSC makes a fair distribution of costs between different classes of customers and whether all interests have comparable access to the MPSC.

The committee also will investigate if automatic adjustment clauses, which permit rate increases without hearings and notice to customers, are necessary and appropriate.

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Fall Festival board readies applications

PLYMOUTH—Fans of the chicken barbecue or the fish fry will be happy to know that plans are under way for this year's Plymouth Community Fall Festival.

Stated for the weekend of Sept. 4-7, this year's 20th annual Fall Festival promises to be "even better than last year," according to Festival Manager Ed Page.

"We'll have 32 booths available this year for non-profit community groups," Page explained, "and the layout will be expanded allowing for larger booth space." Plans call for booths to be located both north and south of Penniman along Main Street.

PAGE SAID inquiries have been coming in since January from arts

and crafts groups and prospective participants for the Antique Mart.

Letters were recently sent to participants of last year's festival inviting them to participate again.

Deadline for space reservations has been set at July 30, but booth space will be awarded on a "first-come" basis beginning June 11.

Added attractions at this year's festival will be the visit of some 500 families who are members of the Air-stream Travel Trailer Club. The groups will be hosting a round-up that weekend on the athletic field of East Middle School.

The festival office this year will be housed in a motor home on the site and Page and co-chairman Carl Glass will carry walkie-talkies to improve

coordination of the festival. With a hook-up with the Plymouth Police Department, safety will also be improved.

A MAJOR CHANGE for this year's participant will be the handling of state sales tax.

In the past the tax was paid directly to the Fall Festival Board and then forwarded to the state. This year, participating groups will be responsible for their own sales tax liability.

Applications at \$15, along with proof of liability insurance, are available through Page in the office of pupil personnel services at Central Middle School.

"I'd like to stress the importance of groups getting their applications in as soon as possible. Only a limited number of spaces are available and we'd like to insure that all community groups can be represented," Page said.

This will mark Page's first year as festival manager, replacing Tony Flum who served in the job for nine years.

School sets meals for senior citizens

PLYMOUTH—Beginning today, senior citizens in the Plymouth Community School District may put away their lunch-time cooking utensils and savor inexpensive, well-balanced meals at Central Middle School, located at Church and Main in downtown Plymouth.

The pilot program will run Monday through Friday from 11:50 a.m. to 1 p.m. through June 25 and is open to all senior citizens in the Plymouth Community School District.

Cost of the hot type-A lunch, which includes nutritious food from all four basic food groups, is 80 cents. The same luncheon is served to students and faculty members.

Three circular tables in the front of the cafeteria have been reserved for senior citizens, who must provide their own transportation to the school.

"OUR SCHOOL is located in the center of the town, and there are a number of retired persons close by," said assistant principal Brian Kidston. "Sometimes people living by themselves don't prepare a well-balanced meal."

The program, Kidston maintains,

will benefit students and senior citizens alike and improve communications between the two age groups.

"Many of the students don't have contact with people of this age," said Kidston. "We expect this to give them a chance to converse with them. We're also aware that many adults sometimes don't understand what's going on in the school. This will make them aware."

A GROUP of four student council representatives will assist senior citizens each day, Kidston said. The school's administration has encouraged students to mix with the older generation.

Kidston credits principal Gus Gorgone for initiation of the pilot program. Gorgone learned of a similar program in another school district and organized a committee of school administrators, senior citizens, parents, teachers and cafeteria managers to determine the need of such a program in Plymouth.

The School administration will continue the program next year, Kidston said, if it proves successful. Senior citizens will be asked to fill out information cards for evaluation purposes.

Siefker resigns from planning post

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—Dale Siefker, a member of Plymouth Township's planning commission since January, 1972, has resigned because of a job transfer to Moline, Ill.

Siefker was first appointed to the planning commission to fill the unexpired term of Harper Stephens. He was reappointed to three-year term in July 1972.

Siefker was elected vice chairman of the commission in January 1974, and reelected in January 1975. During his three-year term, he served as chairman of the highway impact committee and twice formulated the annual budget report.

"Dale has dedicated himself to the development of the Township of Plymouth and its fast growing area,"

said the board of trustees in a resolution honoring Siefker. "His interest and constant demand to develop the area in an orderly manner has been evident by his past endeavors.

"As a planning commission member, he has combined perspicacity with selfless dedication and integrity. As a fellow citizen unusually concerned with the problems of his community and the welfare of the people, he has displayed a forthright sense of true responsibility."

Siefker's resignation leaves two vacancies on the nine-member planning commission. Melville Troyer resigned last October, and Supervisor J. D. McLaren has been unable to locate a replacement, according to Mrs. Richardson.

Station plans change

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP—The township's new fire station on Wilcox Road may end up smaller than originally expected.

The board of trustees Tuesday authorized Robert Carrigan of the architectural firm Cummins and Barnard to proceed with the detailed drawing of the station's scaled-down blueprint.

Under the new plan, the station will cost the township an estimated \$192,000—a figure close to the budgeted amount.

To cut corners from the cost, Carrigan sliced 1,000 feet from the building's total square footage, which now totals about 4,000 square feet.

The dormitory, originally designed to accommodate six persons, will now accommodate four, and offices for the fire chief, the fire inspector and a secretary have been eliminated from the plan.



Zoo welcomes summer visitors

Summer hours are in effect now through Sept. 7 at the Detroit Zoo, Ten Mile and Woodward, announced James C. Savoy, zoo director.

The zoo will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays and Saturdays, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sundays and holidays.

There is no admission charge on Fridays. On other days admission is \$1 for those 13 and older, and 50 cents for youngsters six to 12. Children under six are admitted free. Senior citizens, handicapped persons and supervised school groups always are admitted free.

The zoo parking lot fee is \$1 on weekdays, \$2 on Sundays and holidays. On all days, except Fridays, there is a \$2 charge per vehicle, which covers admission for all occupants regardless of the number.

The 30-minute animal show in the Holden amphitheater is 25 cents. There is no show on Fridays. The zoo railroad is operating and the fare is 25 cents one way.

A three-acre picnic area with 125 tables is provided north of the parking lot. There are no stoves, and open fires on the ground are not permitted. Personal grills are allowed. Tables are not reserved. The zoo operates several refreshment and souvenir stands throughout the park.

Bicycle riding and roller skating are not allowed. Photographs may be taken as long as photographers remain in nonrestricted areas.

The children's zoo in Belle Isle Park will open Thursday, May 15. Admission is 25 cents, with a 15 cent rate available for organized groups. Hours are 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. weekdays, 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Sundays and holidays.

Mettetal facts must be weighed carefully

through the emotion that will surely be part of the public hearing. And we hope that when the board does separate the facts from the bias and emotions, it will consider the township as a whole, not just the vested interests of affected homeowners and businessmen.

Perhaps the hottest issue to come before the new administration in Canton Township is the purchase of Mettetal Airport. It is a topic that has homeowners jumping and pilots and businessmen worried.

On May 28, the township will conduct a public hearing on the matter, and the turnout will probably be sizable, judging from the concern the issue has already generated.

Undoubtedly there will be heated discussions, both in favor and against purchase (and expansion) of the airport.

Arguments are bound to be tinged with emotion and bias because the issue hits so close to home for many residents of the township.

Pilots and businessmen, who use the airport for both pleasure and business, have much at stake, and they can be expected to be vocal.

SOME FACTS on the airport are still to come. The Federal Aviation Agency is currently doing a traffic study on Mettetal, and hopefully the results will be available for the hearing.

One fact is in, and it is important. The airport, as a private facility, is in danger. The owners, faced with rising taxes, cannot afford to operate it much longer. Their competition, municipal airports, do not pay taxes and often receive federal and state aid. The Mettetal brothers, current owners of the airport, say the rapid increase in land values has made their facility inoperable as a private facility.

This would indicate the fate of the airport lies with Canton Township. If the township does not purchase it, it seems unlikely the airport will survive much longer.

Pilots who use the facility claim that if Mettetal fails, it will be gone forever. Getting a new airport, they say, will be next to impossible.

THIS BRINGS us to the crux of the matter.

How much does the airport affect the tax base of the area? How much does Mettetal have to do with the economic well being of the Plymouth-Canton community? Does it attract industry, and if so, how much? Does it prevent industry currently located in the area from leaving?

These are significant issues in light of the rapid growth Canton is experiencing. Rapid development of subdivisions means greater demand for municipal services, and those services have to be supported to some degree by industry. Planners say new homes are barely paying for the services they demand.

We don't know the effect of Mettetal on the Plymouth-Canton area. No doubt it is responsible for noise and homeowner discomfort, problems that would be aggravated should the airport be expanded.

Expansion of the airport seems assured if the facility is purchased by Canton. The financial feasibility study most recently completed by R. Dixon Speas and Associates says the airport fails to meet federal standards to receive federal assistance. Without federal assistance, cost of the airport would virtually double and the township would be unable to purchase it.

THE REPORT, while filled with contingencies, suggests that Canton could buy the airport and make a profit. But homeowners have raised significant questions about the report's validity.

Deciding to purchase the airport or leave it to its uncertain fate is a big responsibility and a deci-

sign that will affect the area for years to come. We hope the township board is able to cut

Redford Union takes Stevenson regional

Observer & Eccentric Relays champion Redford Union showed the same depth that won that meet when it took Saturday's Michigan High School Athletic Association Class A regional track meet Saturday at Livonia Stevenson High School.

The Panthers picked up only two firsts but used their depth to take the meet over 18 competing schools. RU had 33 points compared to Westland John Glenn's 28. Stevenson was third with 25 1/2.

Redford Union's only individual first place came in the 440 yard run when Jim Lalonde held on to nip Salem's Mark DeMerit by one-tenth of a second.

The first three places in each event advance to the track and field finals Saturday May 31 at Flint Northwestern High School.

DeMerit came back for a first of his own when he blazed the 220 yard dash in 22.4 seconds to win by a neck.

BUT THE TOP individual performance in the meet had to belong to Glenn's Tom Jakubowski. Jakubowski won both the high and low hurdles and finished second in the long jump to qualify in three events.

Livonia Churchill picked up a pair of firsts in the field events. Bill Reardon, one of the top shot putters in the state and a legitimate threat in the finals, easily outdistanced his rivals in that event with an area high of 56 feet. Rick Powers won just as convincingly in the pole vault, going 14

feet—more than a foot better than the nearest competition.

Garden City East's dynamic distance duo of Art Kitz and Doug Sweazy continued to show why they are among the best around.

Sweazy grabbed an early lead in the mile and easily won the event in 4:22.9. John Glenn's Ted Unhold finished gamely to take second and East's Dennis Volz limped in third.

Kitze had more problems than he expected in the two mile. Kitz, who has been clocked in less than 9:30 this season took the event in 9:50.4.


"He won the event, that's the important thing. I expect his time to improve at least 20 seconds at the state meet," said baffled East coach Brian Murphy after the race.
