How schools decide on food

"Who uses brownie mix?"

"I do."
It saves on the butter and sugar," said Thelma Courts.

Cafeteria managers of Plymouth Community School District were meeting Friday to discuss the quality of the bulk foods used for lunches in the Plymouth school system. Tom Anbatt, purchasing agent for the schools, had called them together to get opinions on the various brands which had submitted bids for the upcoming school year.

WHEN THERE was doubt about a certain product, and dissatisfaction with one used last year, an unmarked can of the food was opened and a tasting session followed.

As they went down the long list, most voiced approval of the familiar brands.

Last year's cheese cake passed the test with the remark, "It is all right if you make it in the morning; it doesn't thicken up in time for lunch."

The "spoon-ready" vanilla pudding was acceptable if "you doctor it up with fruit—bananas, or even peanuts."

Last year's shipped apples met with resistance. There were seeds, cores and stems in it.

A large No. 10 can was opened and samples passed around. It met with their approval.

The 11 cafeteria managers were as concerned about the taste and quality of the food as they would be about that used for their own families.

Buchman murder trial moves into fifth day

The story of an alleged murder which started with a meeting in a Canton apartment and ended with death in Plymouth Township found its way in court this week.

This latest chapter is the first degree murder trial of Barry Provw, 26, before Wayne Circuit Judge Thomas J. Roumell, for the Jan. 28 shooting death of Terry Buchman.

Michael Pantel, Provw's lawyer, had filed a motion for a separate trial on Monday. Provw had been slated to stand trial with Leslie Provw, 18, and Robert Umney, 23, all of the Plymouth area.

The motion was granted and Pantel waived a trial by jury. A defense motion to quash because of insufficient evidence for the first degree murder charge was denied.

Prosecutor Richard Whitney first called Thomas Buchman Sr. to the witness stand. The father of the victim said his son lived at home and was unemployed, and said also he had last

seen his son a day before the murder.

DR. SAWAIT KALUEN, who had prepared the autopsy report on Buchman, testified that a rifle bullet had entered the right forearm below the elbow, exited through the upper arm, breaking no bones. It then entered the chest and pierced the heart with a slightly upward trajectory.

He also had suffered a shotgun blast to the right side of the head. Either wound could have been fatal, said Kaluen. The bullet and wadding were presented as evidence.

He said the autopsy showed an alcoholic content of 12. There was no positive showing of any narcotics and he did not run a test for LSD.

LLOYD CASH, 21, took the stand Wednesday afternoon.

Under direct examination he said he had helped Provw locate a person named Curley. Provw said he wanted Curley to return a ring he had sold to him for \$50. Cash arranged a meeting of the two.

Later, another meeting was arranged for 1 a.m. Jan. 28 in Cash's Deer Creek apartment in Canton, according to Cash, and Curley said he was going to bring along his uncle, Benny Montgomery.

Cash said he, Provw, Umney, Leslie Provw and Buchman waited for Curley's arrival, and when he didn't show up the mood changed.

Cash said he was threatened at that time and again in the car when they went out to search for Curley and buy more beer. He testified that Provw fired a shot from his rifle through the floor of his (Cash's) apartment.

When they ended up on Ridge Road, Cash said Umney ordered him out of the car, hit him in the face several times with the butt of a gun and then pushed him to the ground with the gun.

He testified that "Terry bolted from the car." Provw took after him and fired the rifle at him. Cash said

he thought he saw Buchman stumble but then they disappeared.

He said, "Bob left and told Leslie to guard me. She kicked me in the chest and told me to stay down. Leslie didn't do anything to harm me; she wanted me to stay down."

At that point he said he ran to a nearby house and asked them to call police.

UNDER CROSS EXAMINATION it was established that Cash did assist in arranging the meeting between Curley, Provw and Umney.

He earlier testified that he did not use pot, dope or alcohol.

Later he admitted to "10 or 11 beers and I had half a hit of LSD" but it didn't do anything for me.

At this point the judge warned spectators to be quiet or they would be asked to leave the courtroom.

Two officers from the Wyoming State Highway Patrol, Patrolmen

Plymouth youngsters find 'treasures' in backyard

What started out to be a fort-building project turned into an archaeological dig for Ken Kops, 13, and his sister Rose, 9. And they didn't have to travel far to unearth these remnants of another era. The excavation was in their own backyard at 366 W. Ann Arbor Trail, Plymouth.

A casual wish that they might find a dinosaur bone was voiced by Rose as they started shoveling the light sandy soil.

At a depth of about one foot they hit what must have been an old trash pile or dump.

Pieces of broken bottles that glowed with a luster of pink, green, purple and gold were unearthed. A few cut fingers and Band-aids later, they decided to use a little hand cultivator to rake out the assortment.

THEIR PARENTS, Mr. and Mrs. Clayton Kops, became interested in the youngsters' discoveries. They knew their big farmhouse, with its hand-hewn beam and square nails, dated back to Civil War days. They had found an old flatiron when digging in the garden several years ago.

Ken and Rose found a pair of rusted ice skates—single runner clamps, a rusted small animal trap and a bent tin cup.

But the intact bottles with lettering were most interesting.

Some were colored glass. Those of clear glass were clouded and lustered, or imperfect with hundreds of little bubbles.

Among them were: "Sperm Sewing Machine Oil," "Dr. D. Zimmerman & Co. Druggist, Wayne, Mich.," "Elegant Flavoring & Extracts," and "C.A. Pinckney, Plymouth."

When Mrs. Kops took a turn at the dig she found a Lydia E. Pinkham bottle. "Wouldn't you know I'd find that one," she said.

KOPS CALLED the Wayne Histori-

cal Society and was told Dr. David Zimmerman operated a drugstore in Wayne from 1878 to 1888. The "D. & Co." had been his brother.

C.A. Pinckney had been in Plymouth in 1906. Kops is doing more research on him.

Ken, an eighth grader at Central Middle School, is also a carrier for the Plymouth Observer & Eccentric. He is continuing with the dig.

When asked if this would influence him to become an archeologist, he replied: "This is a lot of fun, but I still want to be a baseball player."

Young merchants try street sales

What busy housewife could resist fresh produce, low prices and a friendly smile? Not many, because Tina and Tom Munding said they had made a lot of sales after three hours of hard work on Ann Street in Plymouth.

Tina, 13, and Tom, 7, have helped their family raise a vegetable garden at Gottfredson and Joy roads. The garden flourished, and, despite their large family of 12, a surplus of produce remained.

Recently the children asked their parents if they could sell vegetables and, when granted permission, began pushing their wheelbarrow down Blunk and Arthur streets.

On Thursday, with still an abundance of vegetables, Tina and Tom displayed their produce in the wheelbarrow for a fourth time, this time going door-to-door down Ann Street. They began at Junction and by the time they were past Farmer, they

had made almost \$3 in sales.

Business was doing so well that, although they started with more than two dozen ears of sweet corn, Tina returned home to replenish the supply. They have been selling sweet corn for 60 cents a dozen, small muskmelons for five cents a piece, large melons for 35 cents, and cucumbers and hot peppers for a nickel.

The children's piggy banks must be near full now because 75 cents of every dollar is divided between Tina and Tom while the remaining 25 cents is divided among the rest of the family.

Tina and Tom are eighth and second graders at Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic School on William and live with their parents, Jim and Connie Munding, at 775 Irvin in Plymouth.

Tina, who is the bookkeeper, says they have made more than \$8 this summer. The children have found this is an enjoyable pastime and plan to sell more of the produce again this summer.

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Area teenagers win 4-H honors

Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth Township youth participated last week in the 29th annual Wayne County 4-H fair held at the fairgrounds in Belleville.

About 700 members of 4-H clubs had exhibits with many 4-H members entering numerous exhibits including horses, rabbits, chickens, sheep, goats, pigs and cows.

The fair featured more than 20 clubs showing horses with from three to 23 horses per club. There were 60 different performance classes for horses and ponies with members from this area earning numerous ribbons.

Taking home prizes from the fair were members of Plymouth's Towne and Country 4-H club as well as Canton's Denim Dudes club.

There were also winners in the Plymouth 4-H Bridle Club No. 221 whose members went to court to force acceptance of their applications to enter their horses in competition at the fair.

Association officials had said the applications were received after the May 15 deadline and refused to accept them. The club members, however, claimed they had sent their applications to the Wayne County 4-H Fair Association on May 13.

Wayne Circuit Judge Roman S. Gribbs, after listening to three hours of testimony, ruled the club members were eligible to compete in the fair events.

Gribbs said there was "apparently a misunderstanding between the Plymouth club and the officials of the association."

The fair was held from Aug. 12 through 17. Some winners in this fair will compete at the state 4-H fair in Lansing later this month.

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
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Five Mile construction

Schools award contracts

The Plymouth Board of Education has awarded contracts, totaling \$89,510, for: renovation of the administration building's second floor; the purchase of band instruments and plumes; and the patching and paving of four school district parking lots.

School board members unanimously agreed to award the contract for renovation of the administration building's second floor to the low bidder, Dan Durst Construction Co., for \$37,869. The company will partition the current open space on the second floor into separate offices for various school district departments.

The conference room in which school board members sometimes meet will remain open, while folding

doors on office space adjacent to the conference room will offer more seating area.

Board members unanimously agreed to award contracts for band instruments and plumes for the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) Marching Band to the low bidder, Hammill Music, Inc., for a total of \$6,481.

The district will purchase eight alto clarinets, one oboe, three tenor saxophones, one baritone saxophone and three bass clarinets at a cost of \$5,083 for students enrolled in the district's music program. The school district often provides expensive musical instruments for its students' use.

The board awarded another contract to Hammill Music, Inc. for the \$1,398 purchase of 200 red, white and blue plumes for the CEP marching band. The eight-inch plumes represent the blue and white school colors of Plymouth Salem High and the red and white colors of Plymouth Canton High.

In other action, the board unanimously agreed to award a contract for asphalt paving and patching work at Plymouth Salem High and Galli-

more, Smith and Tanger elementary schools to the low bidder, J. Boyle Co., for \$45,160.

The paving project and renovation work at the administration building were projects outlined in the school district's 1974 bond issue. Funds for the purchase of band instruments and plumes will come from the Plymouth Canton Phase Three equipment budget.

Keith Emerson and Dennis Cook, were called after Cash. They had apprehended Provow, his wife, Leslie, and Umney on Jan. 31, near Laramie, Wyo.

Provow, who has been held in Wayne County Jail since he was returned to Michigan, wore bungee slacks and jacket. He appeared to be very pale.

Provow's trial resumes today (Monday) and observers expect it to continue through the end of the week.

The jury trial of Leslie Provow and Robert Umney is expected to begin next week. Robert B. Delaney of Plymouth, attorney for Umney, says his client will take the stand and deny he fired either the rifle or the shotgun.

Miracles, adventure on Maid of the Mist

On a July day in 1960, a boat owner took two young friends for a motor boat ride on the Niagara River above the famous falls.

The motor failed. Carried by the swift current, the boat swamped casting its occupants into the water.

Spectators on the U.S. side of Horseshoe Falls spied a girl being swept along by the river. Two of them miraculously were able to yank her out just before she reached the brink.

The boat owner went over and perished. But the girl's seven-year-old brother, wearing only a life jacket against the power of the falls, went over the edge.

Another miracle took place. He dropped 161 feet to land in a pool rather than on the rocks. He then bubbled to the surface close to one of the famous "Maid of the Mist" excursion boats. The boat's crew pulled him to safety.

While such dramatic rescues are by no means daily fare aboard these boats, a ride on a "Maid of the Mist" is one of the best things to do at Niagara Falls.

The boats can be boarded on either side of the river near Rainbow

Bridge. On the American side, you'll descend to the river in a glassed-in elevator. On the Canadian side, descent is by means of a kind of perpendicular cable chair, an adventure in itself.

Going aboard the "Maid" you'll be handed a thick black raincoat, which may seem an unnecessary precaution if the day is fine. Be reassured, it has its uses.

Once your broad-beamed boat, more matron than maid, chugs close to the falls, you'll be happy to be well covered and have a waterproof pocket for your camera.

The spray is drenching, but at the same time exhilarating.

Another adventure is to go underground. At one time the Niagara area must have been a tunnel diggers' paradise. One of the best trips involving their work is to the Cave of the Winds.

Down through the rock cliff you go in an elevator which deposits you near the base of the Bridal Veil Falls. Looking up from below, you find there is nothing bridal about them.

Standing on the Hurricane Deck and wet by their spray, you sense their force.

A second tunnel is located at Table Rock House. Its subterranean elevator will take you to an observation post near the bottom of Horseshoe Falls.

A third tunnel can be found by driving along the lower rapids on Canada's River Road. Stop at the Great Gorge building where again an elevator will take you to the water's edge and a view of the Whirlpool Rapids.

You can also visit the Daredevil Gallery.

A little further along this road, the aero car is ready to carry passengers to the opposite side of the river over the rushing white water.

The aforementioned Daredevil Gallery is the repository of much of the Evel Knievel type of history of the area. For in America's less mechanized past, derring-do frequently took the form of shooting over Niagara Falls in a barrel or crossing above the lower rapids on a tightrope.

A gutsy but foolhardy woman named Anna Taylor was first to survive a trip over Horseshoe Falls, riding in a barrel of such flimsy construction that her survival was unbelievable.

Others made it in a steel drum or a specially constructed rubber ball. But

there were those who didn't survive.

At the turn of the century, tightrope walkers regularly strung their wires over the river and then walked across. In 1876 Marie Spelterini made it to the opposite side with baskets tied to her feet.

But this was tame stuff compared to the act put on earlier by the incomparable Blondin. He pushed a wheelbarrow half way across, stopped and cooked an omelet in the middle of the wire. Then he dined and continued his trip.

This sensational kind of history appeared to have been lost forever until recently when two French tightrope walkers made plans to ply their trade above the Niagara River.

However, the bizarre and the commercial have never really left the area around this natural wonder. They live on in the form of aquariums, wax museums, marinelands, a hall of fame, a Houdini museum and countless gift shops.

In addition there are several towers from which the falls can be viewed. Replicas of the British crown jewels can be seen at Table Rock House.

To some this aspect of the falls may hold no interest. To others it may be fascinating.

Not long ago a couple knocked themselves out to make sure their children saw all the important things that pertained to the falls themselves.

They even arranged to stay at the Lock Seven motel in Thorold from whose balconies huge freighters can be seen going through one of the locks of the Welland Canal.

But after emerging from an hour in the Believe It or Not by Ripley emporium, one of the children exclaimed, "That was the most interesting thing I ever saw in my whole life."

What can one do? Chacun a son gout, as they say in French Canada. Each to his own taste.

Accommodations on both sides of the falls are plentiful and range from expensive (close to the water), to medium, and even include tourist homes. Two parks are available for picnics, one on the American side on Goat Island; the other in Canada. It is called Niagarara Glen and is below the Aero Car is location.

Other parks are available for looking. Flowers abound in such places as Queen Victoria Park, which also has a rock garden, and the Oakes Garden. A huge floral clock can be seen just north of the Sir Adam Beck Power Plants.

A horticultural school is also in the vicinity and invites visits.

The area is rampant with history. Old Fort Erie, Old Fort Niagara and Fort George are all interesting places to take young people for a step into the past.


Close to the falls are also historical museums, beaches and a place to serve a system of three canal locks (well, how do you suppose those ocean-going freighters get around the falls?)

Harness racing is available at the Garden City Raceway. Niagara-on-the-Lake has a theater featuring a George Bernard Shaw festival during the summer months.

Traveling to the falls from Detroit, take route 401 from Windsor to a junction past London. Then pick up Route 2, and then a combination of 2 and 53, which eventually will lead to 403 near Hamilton.

This will funnel you into Queen Elizabeth Way, which will deposit you in Niagara Falls.

If you bring Rover, make sure to carry a certificate from his vet indicating that he has had a rabies inoculation within the previous six months. Canada requires this.

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

Park restrictions suggested

A committee of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners has proposed to close Edward Hines Park 1½ hours earlier and is recommending authority for the County Road Commission to shut down other county parks sooner if it chooses.

The proposal would permit visitors in the Hines park from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. only. Present hours are from 5 a.m. to 11:30 p.m., or 90 minutes longer.

The board's public works committee also is considering several other proposals received in a report from the road commission parks department on control of vandalism.

IT IS estimated that vandalism and litter in the nine county parks cost taxpayers \$650,000 annually and occupy park employees who would otherwise be improving the facilities.

According to park officials, the most frequent and serious offenses occur in Edward Hines Park where damage has been repeatedly severe, and where some residents along its 17-mile length say they are enduring "a reign of terror" from unruly young adults.

Other proposals under study by the committee include more park employees, including enough Sheriff's deputies to establish a "sub-station" in Middle

Rouge Parkway, better lighting and a ban on all "no deposit, no return" containers.

OTHER POSSIBLE restrictions would ban deposits of all rubbish, litter and garbage, with fines for anyone leaving picnic refuse in a park area, and a prohibition on all alcoholic beverages, including beer, from April 1 through June 15 each year.

Another suggestion in the report would establish a cash reward program with payment to citizens upon the arrest and conviction of vandals. Under this plan, parents would be financially responsible for damages caused by children found guilty.

Housing act anti-bias expanded

Gov. William G. Milliken has signed into law a bill to expand the Fair Housing Act of 1968 to prohibit discrimination on the basis of age, sex, marital status or physical or mental handicap.

Until the signing of this bill (SB 13), state law prohibited housing discrimination only on the basis of race, color, religion or national origin.

The measure does permit age dis-

tinctions when necessary to meet the requirements of federal, state or local housing programs for senior citizens.

The bill originally passed the House in March and the Senate in May but was recalled at Milliken's request after the Michigan Civil Rights Commission expressed concern over the definition of the term "handicap."

"I also want to emphasize that add-

ing the responsibility for the handicapped to the Civil Rights Department makes adequate funding, as I proposed for the department, all the more urgent," Milliken said.

A new, tighter definition was written into the legislation, specifying that the mental or physical handicap must be a determined condition which may result from "disease, accident, condition of birth or functional disorder."



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Riverside produces National roller champs

In 1863 an American, James Plimpton, designed the first practical four-wheel rollerskate and three years later he opened the first public roller rink in Newport, Rhode Island.

Since that time, rollerskating has burgeoned into a popular international sport and recreation both on the participant side, with rinks in virtually every major American city, and on the spectator side, with international competition and the pandemonium of Roller Derby drawing a specialized interest.

But for two young couples who skate out of Livonia's Riverside Arena, rollerskating is a completely different experience.

"It gets boring sometimes, but we realize that the practice is really important," said Megan Bushrow, 18, of Garden City.

Miss Bushrow and her partner, Bob Hill of Roseville are one of the two couples to whom long hours on the wooden oval have become a way of life.

They finished fourth in the National Amateur Rollerskating Championship

held earlier this month in Lincoln, Nebraska. The other couple out of Riverside, Larry Chopp, 18, of Wayne and Judy Landau, 16, of Northville, won the junior competition.

"Judy and Larry will compete next year for the world title if they can qualify. Megan and Bob will try to take first in the Junior competition," said Mike Etue, the Westland resident who coaches both couples.

The twosomes have been practicing their routines for a year and the practice paid off in Lincoln. With five judges grading the prescribed and freestyle routines, the Chopp-Landau pair received four firsts and a third to take the title while Hill-Bushrow were graded with four fourths and a sixth to place fourth.

All compete in a category known as junior international dance which encompasses the grace of figure skating with the muscular control of skiing.

Etue has been coaching professionally for five years and has been at Riverside for the past three. He has had the championship team under his tutelage for the last two years and has been with the other pair for 10 months.

"Riverside has always been the cen-

ter for international dance in the mid-west," he said.

Etue, himself, is an old hand at the game, having taken a novice dance national title in 1967 before going into the business as a coach.

"International dance is more open to free interpretations," said Etue, a student of his sport. "The other kind of dance, American, is much more rigid."

The two couples finished first and second in both statewide competition in Troy last May and in the regionals held last July in Akron, Ohio.

As to how far either group will go in the world of small wheels, Etue said that, again, it depends on their willingness to sacrifice.

"So much depends on practice," he said. "Both have almost unlimited potential and how far they advance depends on how involved they wish to get."

For now, at least, it's plenty involved. Without the benefit of summer-time standby air conditioning, the two couples while away their afternoons at the Plymouth Road skating house working the same routines that one day might bring a world title as a reward.

Redford Adray splits 2, fights rain, competition

The Redford Adray team which was fighting for a national title this weekend in Johnstown, Pa., was still alive in the tournament Friday but has had to climb from the losers' bracket and fight the natural elements.

"I came all the way to Johnstown to rake out a field," quipped Redford manager Bob Atkins following his team's split of its first two games in the two-game knockout tournament.

Rain hampered conditions during both the team's opening-day 5-4 loss at the hands of Pittsburgh Wednesday and its 16-4 walloping of New Orleans Thursday.

On Friday, the weatherman closed out action altogether.

"They're running a national tournament here and the grounds crew is ridiculously poor. I took the rake and worked on the field myself Wednesday," said Atkins.

Atkins should have let the rain wash out the game completely.

Kevin Bara, who has been the Redford ace all season, was ineffective in his tournament start, allowing four runs in the first three innings in Wednesday's 5-4 loss to Pittsburgh.

Jeff Hodgkins came on in the third and allowed one unearned run the rest of the way. But Redford could not take advantage of several golden opportunities and saw itself moved into the losers' bracket.

Pittsburgh scored two runs in both the first and third innings and one in the fifth on a misplayed flyball and another Redford error. All Pittsburgh runs came with two men out.

Redford scored two runs in the second on Mark Yourchok's bases clearing triple, added one in the seventh on back-to-back doubles by Bara and Yourchok and one in the ninth without a hit. But Dan Burke's line shot down the third base line with one on and two out was snared by the Pittsburgh third baseman, ending the game.

BUT WHAT REALLY hurt the Redford team was the eighth when it put runners on first and third with none out and could not score with its fourth, fifth and sixth batters up.

Yourchok was the only Redford player who had a standout day, recording two doubles, a triple and batting in three.

"We should have won the game. We made two errors and they were costly. We have nobody to blame but ourselves," Atkins said.

Things were brighter following Thursday's battle of New Orleans.

The Redford bats were booming and they sent the southerners packing by a 16-4 count.

Tom Willette came through when it counted for Redford, scattering nine hits, striking out 17 and allowing only three walks.

New Orleans jumped to a 3-0 lead in the top of the first but Redford battled back to tie it in the second. Then four runs in the third, six in the sixth, two in the seventh and one in the eighth buried the usually strong New Orleans entrant.

Homeruns by Yourchok, Mike Kalil and John Broder highlighted the enlivened Redford attack.

Yourchok and Kalil each went three-for-five, picking up three and five RBIs respectively.

Redford continued its quest for its first national title this weekend.

"We're not out of things yet. We hit the ball extremely well Thursday and we have a lot of depth in pitching," Atkins said Friday.

The winners will play a best-of-five set for the league title. The first two games of the final series will be played Thursday in East Detroit.

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

They keep love of music alive and well

By ELLIE GRAHAM

American pioneers hauled pianos and pump organs by covered wagon and flat boat on their westward trek. As small settlements emerged, the arrival of culture, in the form of a piano teacher, was reassurance that this was home—a fit place to rear children.

Through years of changes in growing communities, the piano teacher has remained a constant force, opening new vistas to generations of young students.

Hanna Strasen, dean of Plymouth piano teachers, said many of her former pupils have returned to thank her "for adding the joy of music appreciation" to their lives.

"I suppose many of them are grand-children now," she added.

MISS STRASEN began taking piano lessons when she was seven. Her father was a Lutheran minister in Wisconsin and her teacher was the church organist.

"It was a little square organ. Oh how I used to envy a friend who had a piano with that long keyboard. Later, when we moved to Bay City, we got a piano and it was wonderful."

Miss Strasen first gave lessons in her students' homes, at 50 cents a lesson. Over the years she has had several studios and now has one on Main Street.

Her enthusiasm for life, music and

people continues after more than 40 years of teaching. She has upgraded her training by attending workshops all over the country. Her love of travel resulted in an exciting experience two summers ago. On a trip to the Holy Land she became embroiled in a Middle East war when her ship was seized and narrowly escaped bombing.

SHE SAYS CHILDREN are "a little harder to handle these days. But schools and some parents are more permissive than they used to be."

A former president of the Plymouth Symphony Society and staunch supporter of the orchestra, Miss Strasen said, "The orchestra has done so much—bringing all that great music—making it available. I am so grateful."

She taught at the Hawthorn Center for 15 years and said the greatest attribute a piano teacher can have is patience.

Who are her favorite composers? "Beethoven and Mozart" was her unhesitating reply. Then, with a glorious smile, "If the good Lord would just give me a Steinway and the ability to play all Beethoven's symphonies."

FRAN LANG has been giving piano lessons in her home on Powell Road for six years. Mrs. Lang said she enjoys the one-to-one contact with the children.

"Very few go on to be pianists, but they learn to enjoy music and have a

better appreciation of it all their lives," she said.

Dorothy Green, who has been teaching piano for 20 years, said, "Besides giving the students an appreciation of music, the acquired skill gives them a sense of self worth."

She believes musical ability is not inherited. "With a willingness to work, a person can achieve proficiency without natural ability."

Mrs. Green's favorites are Beethoven and Bach, in that order.

She and Mrs. Lang agree that seven is a good age to begin piano lessons, although Mrs. Lang had one preschooler. He was exceptional as he was already reading books.

"It's good to get them before they get interested in brownies or cub scouts," said Mrs. Green.

THE REV. DALE MILLER says the age depends on the child.

"If a six-year-old wants to play, it's OK. But, if he has a handspan of four keys, he has a problem."

Mr. Miller, assistant minister of First United Methodist Church of Plymouth, was director of music at the University of Hawaii before he entered the ministry. He has been in Plymouth 14 months and has several piano students.

Mr. Miller says methods of teaching piano have changed. "The old key of C is passe."

He uses the Robert Pace method. Pace, a professor at Northwestern University, developed the multiple key approach, which "trains the ears

as well as the eyes and adds dimension."

MILLER RANKS Rachmaninoff as tops in the field of composers, but he loves to play Rubenstein—some little known works, "probably because Rubenstein had huge hands and so do I."

Methods of encouragement have changed too, said Miller, who learned by the old Russian school, "a whack on the hands or head."

Depending on the child, he uses a psychological approach of guilt or non-guilt.

"When he knows the notes and can play the piece, he is halfway there. He then goes on to expression, tone, quality, nuance and so on." Miller said he does not specify the length of practice time.

Mrs. Lang sets practice times according to the child. Both she and Mrs. Green allow their students to intersperse some popular music, when they ask for it.

"They do like familiar tunes," said Mrs. Green. "'It's a Small World' is a great favorite now."

"If they want to learn a popular piece, I choose the music for them,"

said Mrs. Lang. "Some versions are too easy and some are too difficult. CHARLENE DIBBLE agrees that motivation is important."

Mrs. Dibble has been teaching piano for seven years and said the point system of reward works well with some.

She likes to start her students at eight years because of the mathematics involved in the Frances Clark series which she uses.

"At eight, they can add and count easily, and coordination is developed," she said. "The Clark Method uses a 1-3-5 count. They do not learn the name of the note. They start with the black keys and transpose to a different key with a new hand position." Mrs. Dibble attends Francis Clark seminars to keep up with the latest teaching methods.

Her favorite composers?

"For listening, Bach; for playing, Chopin. Though I really love the Baroque music."

Some teachers noted fewer boys taking piano lessons than in the past. Mrs. Dibble said her pupils have been 50-50, although it does vary.

"Talented boys really move along," she said. "But the not-so-talented are easily distracted."

THE AUTOGRAPH system of encouragement has been effective for Mrs. Dibble. Persons (other than members of the family) who have heard the student play autograph the music. The more signatures, the better.

The recital, that ordeal for many a nervous young musician, no longer seems to be a necessity.

Miss Strasen had to call off a recital several years ago when she became ill. She hasn't had one since. She has parties with cookies and punch where the pupils perform for their peers and play musical games.

Mrs. Lang has two informal recitals a year for the parents, but the children enjoy the punch and cookie party when they play just for each other.

"Recitals are good for students who want to continue their music education," was Dale Miller's thought. "It is an opportunity to test themselves. Competition is good for them."

On Plymouth streets

She knew everyone she saw

Inah Jewell of 462 N. Harvey will be 90 years old on Wednesday, Aug. 20. For 67 of those years she has lived in Plymouth.

"I used to know everyone I met on the street," she says.

Nowadays, when she goes uptown, she "doesn't see one person" she knows.

Inah Hayes was born in Milford in 1885. When she was very young her family moved to Northville. Her father bought 40 acres on Wayne Road, 1½ miles north of Wayne, when she was about six or seven years old. There she attended Cady school which still stands on the corner of Cherry Hill and Wayne roads.

Her first visits to Plymouth date back to those grade school days. A wagon-load of children from Cady would drive over to Plymouth Fair every fall.

"The fairgrounds were down between Fairground Street and the railroad tracks. They had a merry-go-round and a Ferris wheel and a lot of booths. It seems to me it lasted for a week or 10 days," she recalls.

In 1904 she graduated from Wayne High School.

IN THOSE DAYS you went into Detroit and took a teacher's examination at the Wayne County Building.

Young Inah Hayes passed the test and her first teaching position was in East Nankin. Her salary for teaching in the one-room school was \$30 a month. She stayed with a family on Lathers and for room and board she paid "about \$3 a week."

"But I was never there for week-ends," she said. "My father always picked me up after school on Friday and took me back Sunday night."

She was going to spend another year at the school but was offered another teaching job at a school near the streetcar line. This meant she could live at home.

"So I resigned during vacation. At the new school I used to get off the streetcar on Michigan Avenue right near Henry Ford's house. The school was near the railroad tracks and the Rouge River.

"THEY TOLD ME, 'Don't come in the morning until the fire is lit and leave when the children go.'"

"There were tramps around there, and it wasn't safe," she added.

In 1908 she married Homer Jewell and moved to Plymouth.

Her friend, Bessie Robison, introduced her to Homer at a dance in Penniman Hall which was over Dibble's and Pinckney's stores on Main Street.

"Over where Del's Shoes is now," she explained.

"Homer used to come to see on the street car."

"And on his last run for the night, the conductor used to start ringing his bell half a mile away so Dad wouldn't miss his ride home," laughed her

daughter. Mrs. Jewell lives with her daughter and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Hadley.

"We lived on Union Street for three months, then moved into the Hall house on Main Street. They tore it down for the new historical museum."

In 1911, her father built a house for the young couple on Church Street. It is the second house from Harvey on the north side of the street.

Her father drove a team over to level off the ground around the new house. "He stayed over night and tied the horses to a tree at the corner of Harvey and Church. There were no houses, just woods north of our house."

The house was heated with a wood range in the kitchen and a base burner in the living room.

"We burned chestnut coal in the base burner and I always had a kettle of hot water boiling for tea."

MRS. JEWELL SAYS her 56 years of marriage were the happiest time of her life. Her husband died 11 years ago.

There were memories of wooden sidewalks and their first automobile bought in 1920.

"A black Ford touring car," she recalls. "We bought it from Charlie Rathburn who was down where Antique Motors is now."

She learned to drive in a Ford sedan. Later there was a Jewett and an Essex. They drove to Sault Ste. Marie in the Jewett — gravel roads all the way.

She loved her garden and her flowers. One of the maples her father brought from the farm more than 60 years ago still stands in front of the Church Street house.

"And in the fall it is still one of the most beautiful trees around."

"Serious traffic tieups could occur on major arteries leading to the Oakland County stadium if the expected crowd of at least 55,000 persons starts arriving less than an hour before the game," explained Arthur C. Gibson, manager of Auto Club's Safety and Traffic Engineering Department.

"The roads leading to the stadium are not equipped to handle the heavy volume of traffic expected for the game," said Gibson, adding that:

"Motorists attempting to reach the stadium area just before kickoff could find themselves part of a massive traffic jam."

The new stadium, which is completed except for the domed roof, is located at the intersection of M-59 and Opdyke Road, just west of the I-75 Freeway. Only three major arteries — M-59, Opdyke and Featherstone — lead directly to the stadium.

"While these roadways are at least two lanes each direction and portions of Featherstone and Opdyke will be changed to one-way before and after the game, ramps connecting the roads are single lanes in several locations," Gibson said. "This could lead to long backups of cars."


Featherstone will be one-way eastbound from University Drive to Opdyke at least two hours before the game and one-way westbound following it. Opdyke will be one-way northbound from Auburn Road to Featherstone before kickoff and one-way southbound after the game.

To help reduce the traffic congestion around the stadium, 100 buses have been leased from the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) to shuttle motorists from four separate locations in the Pontiac area.

The buses will begin running at 9:45 a.m. Oct. 23 from nine locations off Wide Track Drive in the City of Pontiac, the Cider Mill Village in Miracle Mile Shopping Center on Telegraph and Square Lake roads, the nearby Holiday Inn of Pontiac on Telegraph and the Sheraton Motor Inn at 1001 Woodward.

way, and they will be sold at all pick-up locations.

Two lanes of Featherstone will be reserved for bus traffic both before and after the game.

Approximately 8,500 free parking spaces are available at the shuttle bus locations, including 4,000 around Wide Track Drive, 3,000 at Miracle Mile, 1,100 at the Sheraton and 400 at the Holiday Inn.

Only season ticket holders who have purchased parking spaces in advance will be permitted to use the 9,800 spaces on the stadium grounds. Motorists without prepaid parking tickets will be turned away.

There are approximately 11,000 parking spaces within walking distance of the stadium. However, parking rates have not been established. Parking at the stadium is \$3 per vehicle.

To encourage motorists to arrive early for the first event ever to be held in the \$55-million complex, there will be entertainment beginning at 10 a.m. and lasting until game time. There also will be entertainment after the game.

"This is to encourage persons to come early and also spread out departure times following the game," Gibson said.

"The attraction of seeing the new facility also is expected to encourage persons to arrive early," he added.
