Hanh Marie Pham is bringing a new Vietnamese daughter to Miller Elementary School.

The eight-year-old Vietnamese daughter of Ann and Larry Pham, Hanh is a new member of Miller Elementary School and is receiving education in general. Hanh, who arrived in the United States last spring, has had no formal education as far as her parents know.

Testing administered by Plymouth Community School District personnel has placed the tiny eight-year-old in the third grade, combined first and second grade classroom at Miller where she began learning first grade subjects two weeks ago.

Although the English language is still an obstacle to Hanh, the eight-year-old is progressing fine, report her parents, teachers and administrators.

In the photo above, Hanh practices writing in English under the direction of teacher specialist Joyce Reeves. At night, the eight-year-old practices writing in English on a piece of paper, while classmates Keston, Kofka, and Nicole Mauch busy themselves with drawing.

She has some difficulty with the language, said Chads, yet being that the other kids, she has been able to make progress. Her printing now is at the second grade level.



Plymouth Symphony launches annual fund-raising campaign

Music portraying a three-faceted celebration will whisper and blare from the woodwinds, brass, strings and percussion of Plymouth Symphony Orchestra this season and mark the Symphony Society's annual drive for membership and funds.

Members of the Plymouth Symphony Society's Board of Directors have set a record \$24,500 budget to provide an anniversary and bicentennial flavor to the orchestra's 1975-76 season—the 30th for the orchestra and the 25th under the direction of conductor Wayne Dunlap.

ACCORDING TO Dr. Ralph Atchley, secretary of the Plymouth Symphony Society, the group hopes to reap a record \$7,000—\$1,200 more than last year—from this season's family membership drive.

The society already has mailed its membership brochures to former members and other persons on its mailing list, Atchley said. Other persons wishing to obtain membership status should contact Annette Heindryckx, the society's family membership chairperson, at 46000 Ann Arbor Trail or P.O. Box 467, Plymouth.

The orchestra's 1975-76 season will feature music with a bicentennial flair and works by American composers.

A special bicentennial concert, scheduled for March 7, will tentatively feature a specially commissioned folk ballet centered around the Shakers, an early American religious group who believed in the arrival of Christ's second coming and complete segregation of the sexes.

Robert Jones, a music instructor at

Schoolcraft College, will write music for the ballet, if the Symphony Society receives a \$4,800 grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts. Ralph Kelly, an English instructor at Schoolcraft College, will write the story for the ballet, based on the true story of a young couple in a Kentucky Shaker community.

PERSONS MAY view the orchestra's bicentennial and five other concerts at reduced rates through one of five family membership plans.

For \$100 or more, persons may obtain patron status and four tickets to each of the orchestra's six concerts. Persons may obtain sustaining status and three season tickets for \$50; supporting status and two season tickets for \$25; and active status and one sea-

Murder victim's brother testifies

The first degree murder trial of Barry Provow continued this week in Detroit before Wayne Circuit Court Judge Thomas J. Roumell. Witnesses continued to testify on events pertaining to the Jan. 28 death of Terry Buchman in Canton Township.

Cassandra Field was the first to take the stand on Monday morning. She testified that she had been in the Canton Township apartment she shared with Lloyd Cash, Provow, Leslie Provow and Robert Umney when they were awaiting the arrival of Gwyn Kirley.

She said she knew the meeting had "something to do with a ring" and "Barry appeared nervous, but nothing special."

Miss Field said she knew they left the house to get beer and when Provow couldn't get his car started, he came back, pointed a rifle at her, and asked for her car keys. She brushed the gun aside and said she wouldn't give him the keys.

CHERYL VOSS, 19, who was Terry Buchman's girl friend, said she was at Buchman's home on Jan. 27 when Umney, Barry and Leslie Provow arrived. She went with them to get beer

and "later went to Cash's apartment."

She said that while she was waiting in the kitchen she heard them talking about Kirley. Buchman took her home and then she "took Terry back" to the Cash apartment. "He said would be back by 3 a.m."

When he did not return, she called Cassandra at 3:10 a.m. and that was when she heard Buchman had been shot.

She later testified that Buchman had been threatened by Provow in her presence.

RANDY GLADSTONE, 20, of Plymouth, testified that he had loaned Robert Umney a 16-gauge Winchester shotgun and a Marlin 22 semi-automatic rifle about 10 p.m. on Jan. 27. He said he did not ask Umney why he wanted them.

The next witness, James Burrell of Northville, identified the shotgun by assembling the gun and pointing out his name on the stock. He said the gun had been stolen from his house while he was vacationing in Florida during Christmas vacation in 1974.

The shotgun and rifle produced as evidence had been in the possession of

Umney and the Provows when they were apprehended in Wyoming on Jan. 31.

ROD BURRELL, 22, a cousin of James Burrell and also of Northville Township, said he had known the defendant for a number of years.

He said that about 10 p.m. Jan. 27, Umney came to his home with Leslie and Barry Provow. Umney asked for some 16-gauge shotgun shells and 22-caliber rifle bullets. He said he did not know why they came to him but he gave them the shells.

Also called to testify were Tim Buchman who told when he last saw his brother, Terry, alive, and Robert Kennitz of Ridge Road, who testified that Lloyd Cash had come to his home in the early morning hours of Jan. 28 and asked to use his telephone. He said Cash had made two calls, one to the police and one to his girl friend.

HERBERT LUTZ, an evidence technician for the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, was the first witness called Tuesday morning.

He examined the gun and identified

City hikes water bill by average of \$1.65

Water bills in Plymouth will increase by \$1.65 per quarter for the average residential user.

The Plymouth City Commission voted Monday night, 7-0, to raise the sewage disposal portion of the water bill by 30 per cent — from 22 cents per 1,000 gallons of water to 28.6 cents per 1,000 gallons.

That increase will mean that the average resident, who uses 25,000 gallons of water in a three-month period, will pay \$1.65 more per quarter.

THE HIKE became necessary, explains City Manager Fred Yockey, because of the decision by the Detroit Water Board to raise sewage disposal rates effective Sept. 1.

Commissioner Joe Bida said there was nothing the commission could do

but raise the rates and added that he felt there was a need to place the Detroit water system under the control of the Michigan Public Service Commission (PSC) which regulates gas and electric utilities in the state.

Yockey said he did not believe such a step would be wise but added that a bill was now before the Legislature asking for that action to be taken.

The increase in the rates includes provision to cover water loss, caused by leaks, use of water from fire hydrants, for street flushing and other municipal uses. The water loss amounts to about 14 per cent of the total gallons billed to Plymouth, Yockey said, or about \$8,000 a year.

YOCKEY CAUTIONED that one of these days the state or federal government will require treatment of waste water and then costs will go up even further.

The city manager stressed that the city is not making any profit from the increase imposed on the city by the Detroit Water Board and being passed on to users.

The difference between the rate increase approved by Detroit, and that to be charged Plymouth residents, Yockey explained, is a markup to cover administrative, maintenance and water loss expenses.

"There is no profit in the sewage system. In fact, we may have trouble breaking even."

Last year, he added, the city lost \$13,000 in its sewage program and this year expects to break even. The rate increase has been computed to reach a break even point, he said.

Yockey noted that some suburbs are engaged in litigation to fight the rate increase but said Plymouth had to raise its rates by Sept. 1 or have to go in the hole financially on its sewage service.

"I don't think the lawsuit will be successful," Yockey said. "I believe the sewage rate is needed. We haven't seen an independent audit, but I do know the water department is in difficulty with environmental regulations and the cleaning of the Detroit River."

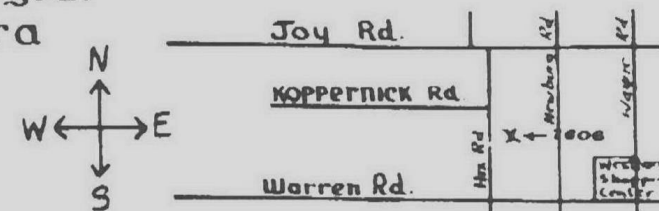
'100-year rain'

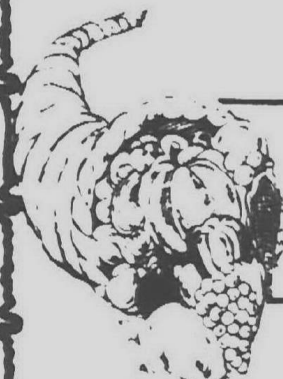

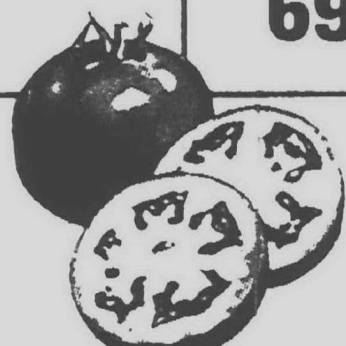

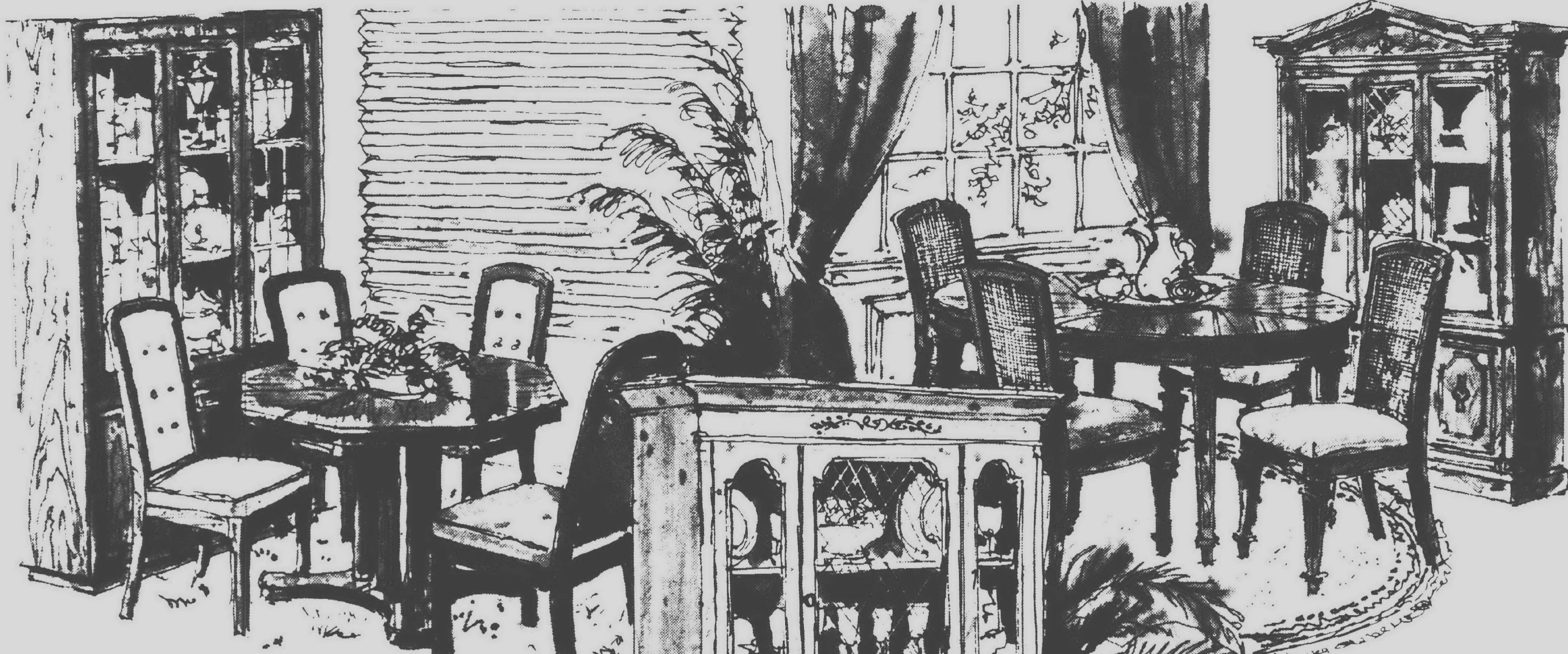

Freshmen will receive adjustment assistance

The first day of school at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) can be a frightening experience for the uninitiated ninth grader who passes through a maze of unfamiliar corridors past waves of unfamiliar faces.

But this year's incoming class of 1,000 freshmen may view the halls of Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools with a twinge of familiarity with the kickoff of the CEP's freshman orientation and advisor program.

THE PROGRAM, scheduled to begin on the first day of classes, will replace the CEP's former orientation program, conducted on a voluntary basis at the time students picked up their schedules.

The new program, according to the CEP staff members scheduled to conduct it, will better equip freshmen with knowledge of the buildings as well as the CEP's complicated modular scheduling.

The program, hopefully, will provide a personal touch to what could be a frightening experience.

"They really need some help," anthropology teacher Liz Carlson said of the CEP's incoming freshmen. "They're so confused when they come here. I think it's the size of the park and the fact that there are separate schools. We want to get away from the idea that they're one in 4,000."

The program will include 1,000 incoming freshmen at Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools, 80 faculty members who will act as advisors as well as 400 sophomores at Plymouth Canton High.

FRESHMEN WILL walk into empty school buildings the morning of Sept. 4 for the start of the orientation program.

Small groups of freshmen and their advisors will tour the school buildings, discuss modular scheduling and solve scheduling conflicts before

upper classmen return to their classrooms at 11 a.m.

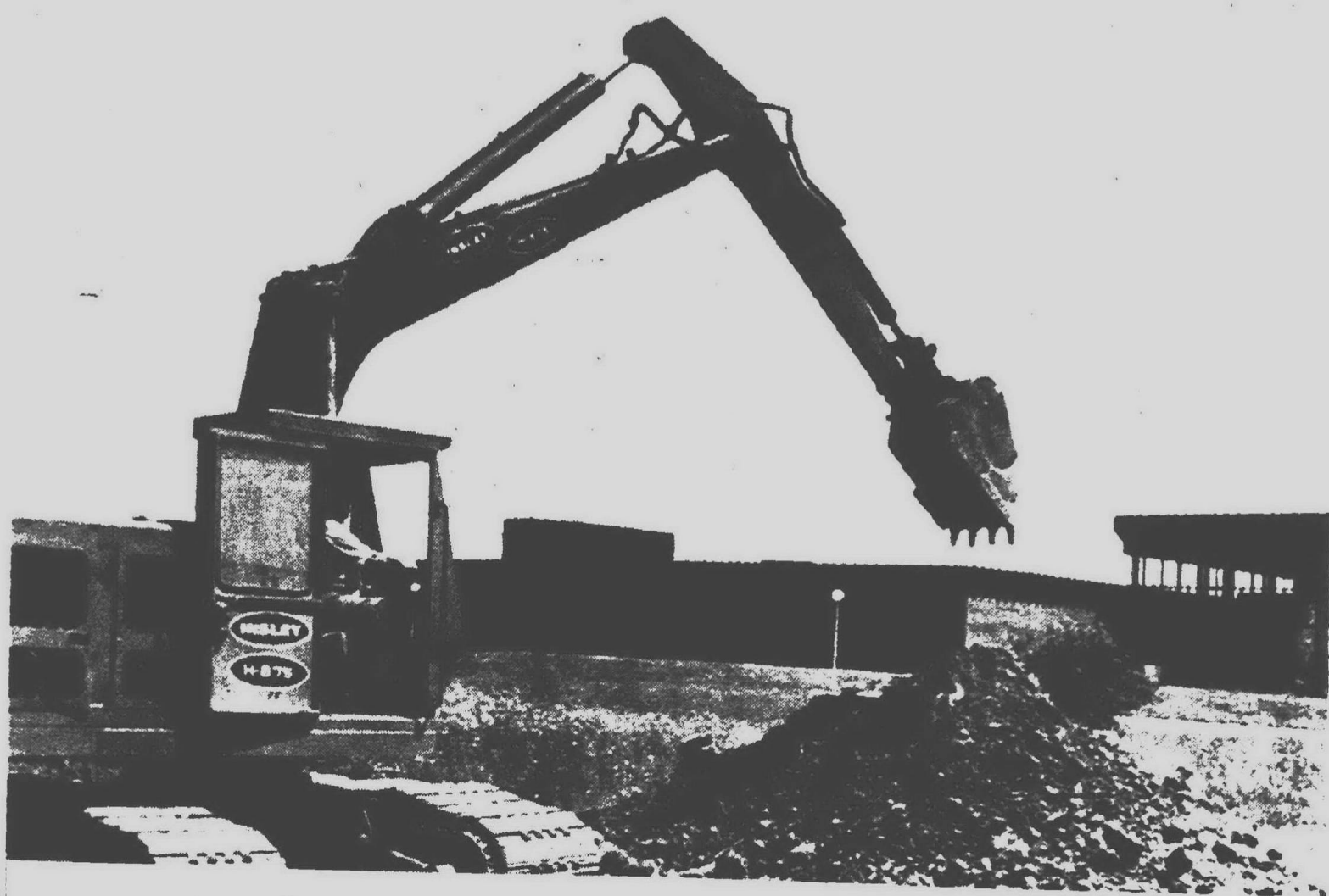
The "advisor periods" are molded into students' schedules for the remainder of the school year to supplement the roles of counselors and add a personal touch to the sprawling two-school park.

ADVISOR GROUPS will discuss projects that could fill students' unscheduled time and participate in a myriad of activities.

"We want to get these ninth graders off on a good step," explained Kris Darby, an art teacher at Salem. "We want to make the point that we're here to help them. We really think it will give some school spirit to the students."

Sophomores at Canton High will meet with advisors on a regular basis to discuss problems they had as freshmen and others they're currently encountering.

"It's just a pilot program, and we could use it through 12th grade," said Mrs. Carlson. "You look at the older students and the apathy about the school and think, 'I wish we could change it.'"

Fife, Drum Corps gets \$10,000 grant

The Plymouth Fife and Drum Corps has received a \$10,000 grant to help finance statewide performances during the 1976 bicentennial observance.

The grant was recommended for approval Tuesday by the reviewing committee of the Michigan Bicentennial Commission.

State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), who made a presentation to the committee on behalf of the corps, says the recommendation will now be forwarded to the executive committee and go to the full commission Sept. 4.

Pursell says, however, that final approval is routine as the commission is expected to act on the recommendations of the review committee.

A full itinerary for 1976 has been arranged by the Plymouth Fife and Drum Corps with at least 40 performances throughout Michigan, including performances at Fort Wayne in Detroit for the Farmington Founders Festival and for a special bicentennial celebration being planned by Observer and Eccentric Newspapers.

Much of the work on the grant application was performed by Don Tripp, who has worked for the group for years.

The Fife and Drum Corps is the first local group to receive a grant from the state. Other groups have applied for state and federal grants for bicentennial projects.

Centennial Park problems, modular scheduling debated

Plymouth Centennial Education Park after five years was the subject of a workshop session Monday night when the Plymouth Board of Education and Supt. John M. Hoben met with CEP principals and area coordinators.

"Is all rosy at the park?" was the question raised by Board Member Joe Gray.

Trustee Tom Yack said he had picked up "vibrations from the community while on the campaign trail." He had read the North Central accreditation report and was concerned about the use of unscheduled time, the attendance policy and lack of preparation in the lower grades for modular scheduling.

"I can't get a handle on what's going on over there," was Marcia Borowski's complaint, and Trustee Gary Mirto said: "The Park and the board got off on the wrong foot." But he added: "There are more strengths than weaknesses."

PLYMOUTH SALEM PRINCIPAL Bill Brown said the revised attendance schedule was a marked improvement last year. There had been fewer parental complaints because the staff had been able to notify parents in time to do something about the problem.

Yack said that, although the policy states that after the fourth time a student misses a class a staff member initiates action, the North Central report says the staff doesn't always follow through.

Coordinator Fred Meier answered: "One of the biggest gripes of staff members was the time wasted on telephone calls. Usually no one is home as 40 to 50 per cent of the mothers work." The mail-out notices had been more effective.

Mrs. Borowski wanted to know, "Why are the kids cutting classes?"

According to Ken Jacobs, coordinator for physical education, art and special education, "Lots of kids just don't want to be there. He conforms by going to school, but he doesn't go to class."

Jacobs said the policy states a stu-

dent may be withdrawn from class after eight absences. "But he needs five credits to be a full-time student. When do we drop them?"

GRAY SUGGESTED that perhaps the "may" should be changed to "shall." "I think it is too lenient," said Mirto. "Nobody wants to be the bad guy. I'm willing to take the responsibility. Let the board be the bad guy."

Dr. Jerry Morris, foreign language and social science coordinator, said, "We are still trying, after eight absences, to remove the problem, not the child."

Plymouth Canton Principal Kent Buikema interjected that they were talking about just two or three per cent of the student population which drops below the five credits.

Hoben reminded the board that the North Central study had been made a year ago, after a one-month teacher strike. "By the end of the school year some criticism in the report was no longer valid."

USE OF THE coordinators' time was questioned.

The coordinators estimated they spend about one-third of their time in curriculum study. Each is responsible for the attendance and minor discipline problems of about 550 students.

Coordinators meet with teachers on a regular basis and work closely with the counselors assigned to their students.

Coordinators usually start with a group of freshmen and follow through the four years of high school.

The advisor-advisee program, which will be initiated this fall at the Park is expected to aid the coordinators and ease the "big school, lost in the shuffle" feeling for freshmen.

Brown referred to it as a "caring for kids" program. Freshmen and sophomores at Canton and freshman at Salem will be divided into groups of about 20. They will spend 40 minutes each cycle (six days) with a teacher who has volunteered for this closer contact with the students.

The advisor will not replace the coordinator or counselor but will be some-

one with whom to discuss problems in a small group or a one-to-one basis.

TRADITIONAL vs. modular scheduling was discussed with the announcement that 63 per cent of the ninth graders opt for the traditional.

Buikema said that although all students go into the modular scheduling at the 10th grade level, English and math follow the traditional format.

Gray said: "I like modular scheduling. My kids are on modular scheduling. But after four years, how can we judge? How does it affect them when they go to college?"

"We're doing dynamic things out there," said Morris.

"But how can you evaluate it?" said Dick Bearup, coordinator for business.

Board Chairman Marda Benson, in

summing up the advantages and disadvantages, said, "We need informed parents and better communication between the board and the park."

Florence Beier, newly appointed administrative assistant for community affairs, said these were problems that she would have a hand in solving.

MIXED UP REPORT cards were a final criticism from Gray, whose children had received grades on courses they didn't take and none on some classes they did take.

Hoben said that the computerized report cards had been a great headache as they shifted from one data bank to another.

The administration now has settled on a system which it believes will solve that problem.

at 13956 Washington, Plymouth Township, is still under investigation by the Michigan State Police Fire Marshal Bureau.

Plymouth Township Fire Chief Jim Gignac says the cause of the fire still is undetermined.

"There are a lot of rumors floating around among residents of the trailer park," said Gignac. "We have checked them out and all of them are unfounded. 'If anyone has information about the fire, they should call the Plymouth Township Fire Department and we will check them out.'"

Beverly and Mitch Ramsey, owners of the 14-by-64-foot Castle mobile home, had left about 1 a.m. to attend a wedding. Mrs. Ramsey returned briefly to the trailer park about 6 p.m.

Neighbors noticed flames in the trailer shortly after midnight and the

Plymouth Fire Department recorded the call at 12:16 a.m.

Mrs. Ramsey called her mother-in-law, who was babysitting for them at her home, shortly after midnight and was told, "Your trailer is on fire."

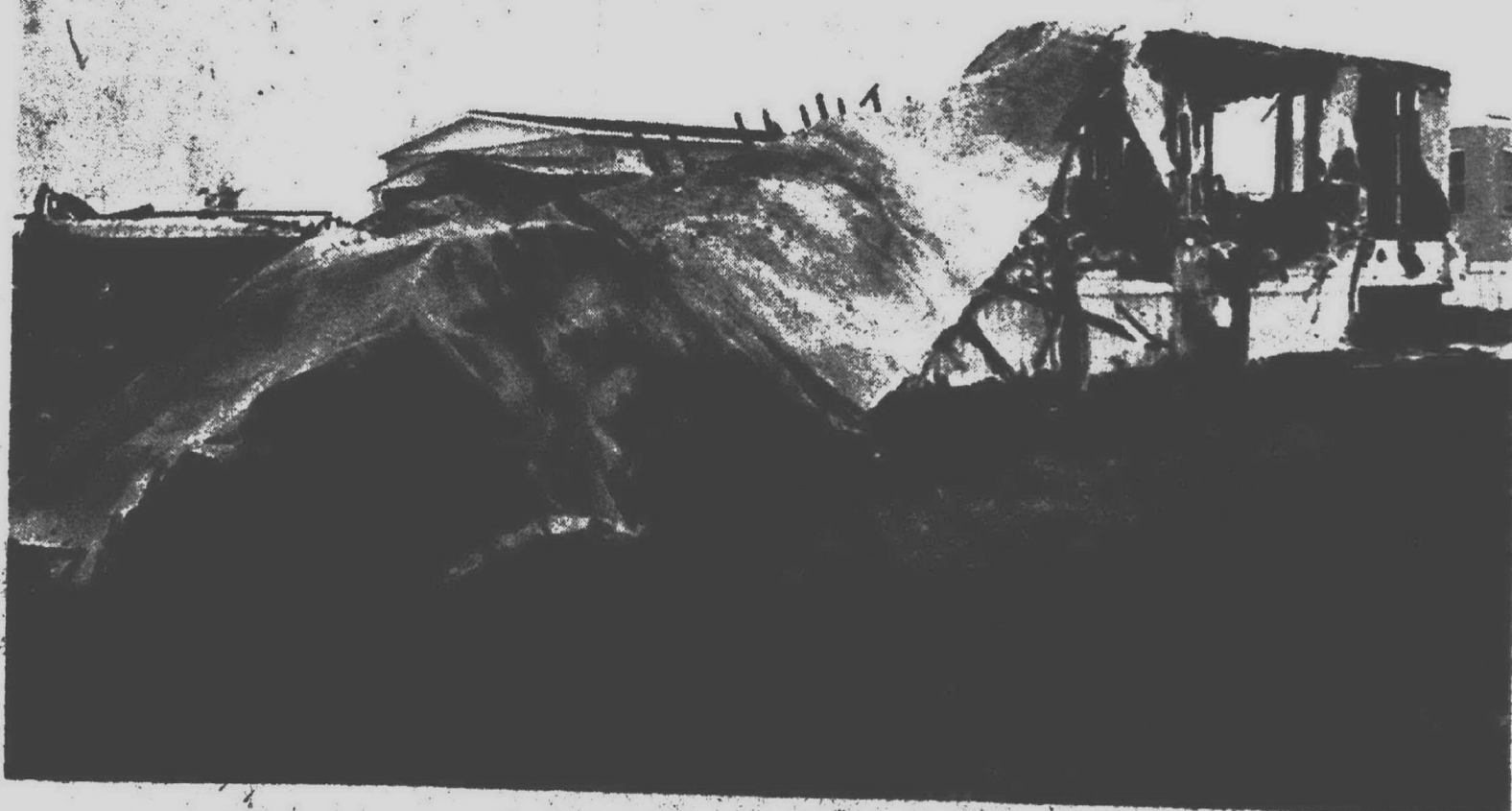
THE HOME was a total loss with damages estimated at \$9,000 for the trailer and \$5,000 for its contents.

The young couple rushed home to find the fire out and the firemen rolling up their hoses.

One week earlier, another mobile home had been destroyed by fire just a block away.

The park is on Ridge Road, just north of North Territorial. It is a newly developed section and most of the homes have been there less than a year and a half.

The Ramseys moved in last August. Mitch Ramsey, 21, works at Chevrolet Spring and Bumper in Livonia.

son ticket for \$16. Senior citizens may obtain one ticket to all the orchestra's concerts for \$5.

Single concert tickets, purchased at the door, are priced at \$3.50 for adults and \$1.75 for senior citizens. Murder trial continues

the shotgun casing and wadding found at the scene of the shooting. He said no .22 caliber rifle shells had been found in the area and no photographs of the area were available because it had been so cold it had slowed the shutter of the camera and blurred the pictures.

The pellet taken from the heart of the victim was identified by David E. Balish of the Michigan State Police Detroit crime laboratory.

He said the pellet came from a Marlin rifle because no other gun, to his knowledge, "has 16 lands with a right-hand twist."

He also said the pellet showed more than the normal distortion caused by hitting flesh—that it must have been deflected by a bone.

GWYN KIRLEY of Plymouth was called to the stand at 2:45 p.m. Tuesday. He said he knew both Urmy and Barry Provow.

Kirley recalled that sometime in June 1974 he "met Barry in Kellogg Park." Provow asked to borrow money and gave Kirley a ring as security for a \$50 loan.

Kirley testified that a friend stole the ring and when Provow wanted either the ring or \$350, Kirley didn't have either.

Cash suggested he meet Provow at Cash's apartment. After backing out of the first meeting, he decided to meet them at 1 a.m. Jan. 28. He said he called the apartment about midnight and told them he was going to bring his uncle, Benny Montgomery, with him. But when his uncle told him to "forget about it" and he was "afraid of trouble," he did not keep the appointment.

A Wayne County Sheriff's Department detective was on the stand Wednesday morning. He showed the leather jacket Buchman was wearing at the time of the shooting. There were two bullet holes—one through the chest pocket where a bullet had entered, and one in the right sleeve where a bullet had exited.

Plymouth ice coach gives up career to teach

Valeri Chase of Livonia recently gave up the glitter and glamour of skating with a professional ice show to teach in Westland, and she's enjoying every minute of it.

"Teaching is a challenge. It's very rewarding to watch your students progress and know that you're helping someone else," says Miss Chase, a 1973 graduate of Stevenson High School.

Formerly a member of the Shipstads & Johnson's Ice Follies chorus, Miss Chase is presently coaching youngsters from Westland, Livonia and Plymouth in the Westland Ice Arena, Cherry Hill and Newburgh, Westland.

MISS CHASE, 20, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Chase joined the follies in fall 1973 after a spur-of-the-moment audition at Detroit's Olympia Stadium. She spent two years travel-

ing with the show and toured more than 25 cities.

The was offered a contract for the 1975-76 season with Holiday on Ice, one of three follies' shows, but declined.

"Two years is enough. It was a tremendous opportunity but I want to get into other things," says Miss Chase.

The skating teacher has been busy modeling. She will enter Schoolcraft College in the fall and plans to study marketing.

Miss Chase began "skating seriously" at eight. "Actually I started at six on my brother's old hockey skates. Two years later I graduated to figure skates."

She completed five of eight figure skating exams, and studied at the Detroit Skating Club under Don Stewart and former Olympic champion Gary Visconti.

She enjoys her duties in Westland and feels it is important for young skaters coming up in the ranks to have an experienced teacher.

ters coming up in the ranks to have an experienced teacher.

She teaches skaters nine to 15 in private and group lessons. In the fall she plans to teach at Ford Field Ice Arena in Livonia in addition to Westland.

MISS CHASE will concentrate on competitive rather than recreational skating because she sees a need for advanced instruction.

"There's really been a skating boom in this area in the last three years and there just aren't enough advanced instructors to accommodate the young skaters," explains Miss Chase.

After teaching only a few weeks,

Miss Chase finds standards, among even beginner skaters, have improved.

"I have never seen so many young children skating so well. The Detroit area continues to produce more fine skaters than many other parts of the country."

She feels her follies' training will benefit her class.

"I LEARNED a lot about stage lighting and choreography from ice show instructors and I hope to pass it along to my students," says Miss Chase.

She admits that many of her students are in awe of her skating accomplishments.

"These youngsters are fantastic.

When I left to join the follies, they presented me with roses. When I returned many brought in their programs from the show and asked for my autograph."

Miss Chase currently teaches intermediate and advanced classes. The class material ranges from basic jumps, spins, edges and strokes to advanced jumps and sessions on style.

"I don't like to see sloppy skaters," says Miss Chase. She encourages skaters to think for themselves and stresses attitude.

"Attitude is important. I would rather see a young skater who has decided to skate, rather than one whose parents have forced her into it."

MISS CHASE's class includes Lori

Carlton, 10, of Livonia and Paige Neumann, 8, of Westland. Both are beginners and practicing to take their preliminary exams.

Brooke Fournier, 10, of Livonia, a former student of Miss Chase, is presently studying with Anne Seror of the Detroit Skating Club. Brooke has completed her preliminary first and second figures, and earned prebronze and presilver status in dance.

Kim Murray, 12, of Plymouth is a private student and has completed her preliminary exam. "I like skating and I like Valeri, she's a good teacher and easy to understand."

This fall, Miss Chase plans to put her nephew, Derek, 2, on skates. "It will take a lot of patience, but it'll be fun," she smiles.

Hulce on Broadway

Understudy from Plymouth gets leading role

(The following story is a reprint from the New Jersey Herald-News. Writer Tom Sullivan wrote: "I had the pleasure this week of preparing the attached story about a young man from your area. If you wish to reprint it you are welcome to do so.")

NEW YORK—It is rare on Broadway for understudies to take over permanently the top roles in lead productions but Thomas Hulce, 21, has done it in the psychological thriller "Equus" and audiences give him an ovation eight nights a week.

He understudied Peter Firth when the show moved into Plymouth Theater from London's West End last October, went on eight times when Firth was indisposed, and assumed the role after Firth and Anthony Hopkins returned to London, June 1.

There were some young actors with moderate name value who thought they ought to get a crack at the role, but in "Equus" the play is the thing and names on marquee don't mean a thing if the goods aren't delivered believably. So unknown Tom Hulce from Plymouth Mich. is now a Broadway star.

The role of a sorely troubled stable boy who gouges out the eyes of his equine charges, then engages in a remarkable mental duel with his psy-

some of the participants were established performers, but it went very well.

AFTER THAT came a period in stock at Booth Bay, Maine, with roles in "Three Sisters," "The Philanthropist," "School for Wives" and "The Play's the Thing."

And then Hulce thought he might be ready for an assault on Broadway.

He had heard about a role suitable for his age and appearance in a Chelsea Theater production of "Total Eclipse" but they turned him down,

so he wound up taking a job as a costume shopper for Joseph Papp's New York Shakespeare Festival.

"I had rent to pay and food to buy and a job is a job, but in any case, I don't think you can ever know too much about theater craft," he said.

He tried out for the understudy part in "Equus," which was to go into rehearsal in September for an October opening.

"I did four auditions and they were interested, but I never heard anything so I proceeded as if I didn't have it."

THAT INCLUDED accepting a role in David Rabe's revision of "The Orphan," which was to open in an off-Broadway equivalent of Philadelphia. While there, he got the call that he would be Firth's understudy and he returned to New York.

He took over for Firth twice during previews and six times during the run, with audience reaction highly favorable. Along the way he had signed with an agent, Bret Adams, and offers for television work and other roles started coming in.

"I decided to stay with 'Equus' though and I didn't dream I would wind up with the lead," Hulce added.

It turned out to be a wise choice and there have been some television roles in between.

Hulce admits to being in a trance the first time he had to go on in "Equus" and each night starts out with butterflies until he steps on stage.

"ONCE YOU GET into the play, it takes over. I love it," was his summation.

Because he has a nude scene, and generally has to have a frail, vulnerable look, anyway, the enjoyment of good food is one by-product of success that he must forego, watching very carefully what he eats.

Once in a while someone will recognize him in a public place and stop him to talk about the show, which invariably sticks with those who see it.

"I don't mind when that happens," he said. "Being in a play this good and pleasing audiences is a tremendous satisfaction."

chiatrist (now played by Anthony Perkins) is a tour de force and Hulce does it great justice.

IT MIGHT SEEM unlikely because of the distance from sleepy Plymouth, Mich., to Plymouth Theater on 45th Street, but in the five years it took him to make the trip, the youth devoted himself single-mindedly to learning theater craft.

He was the youngest of four children in a family with no theatrical antecedents. His father is a Ford Motor Co. executive and they lived on a gentleman's farm with a small assortment of livestock about 45 miles from Detroit.

Tom never did well in high school, being convinced by then that his future was in acting. He would hitchhike to Ann Arbor and badger people at the various theatrical enterprises for some kind of work—anything.

"I moved scenery, handled lights, and sometimes got a small role," he explained over lunch at Gallagher's. "I even landed the lead role in 'Oliver'—making me one of the better-fed Olivers."

But he was convinced that continuing his high school with all the frustrations that involved was a waste, and he talked his parents into letting him spend his 11th grade year at Interlochen, a distinguished music and drama school financed by millionaire W. Clement Stone.

FROM THERE he went to North Carolina School of the Arts in Winston-Salem for his last year of high school and two college-level years, working with instructors of the highest professional standards.

In that period he put in a summer in London, working in a formal program arranged through NCSA and later worked a summer at the Asolo Theater in Sarasota.

"I played lots of soldiers in 'War and Peace' and a newsboy in 'Time o. Your Life' and I got to write a studio version of 'The Effect of Gamma Rays on Man in the Moon Marigolds,' and I fetched and carried," he said.

How do you like directing?

"Fantastic. I was just a kid and

Plymouth Hilton Inn will open in October



DEANE BAKER

The new five-story, 195-room Plymouth Hilton Inn is expected to open in early October.

That announcement was made this week by Deane Baker, owner and developer of the Plymouth Hilton at 14707 Northville Road just south of Five Mile in Plymouth Township. Baker's latest estimate is the total worth of the Plymouth Hilton will be at least \$5.5 million and could reach \$6 million.

BESIDES THE guest rooms, the Plymouth Hilton will have a new restaurant — the Jolly Miller — seating 160.

Adjacent to the restaurant will be a

supper club seating 140 with nightly entertainment, and nearby will be the Park Coffee Shop seating 120.

Other facilities include a 12,000-square-foot ballroom, banquet rooms to handle up to 1,000 persons, and 17 function rooms for groups of 10 to 1,100 persons for meetings, conferences, wedding receptions and other group activities.

The coffee shop is located adjacent to the Atrium — a three-story area with a 50-by-20-foot swimming pool. The entire area measures 80 by 110 feet with a park-like interior that features tall growing trees, flowers, plants and park benches.

CONSTRUCTION of the Hilton started in November 1974 after purchase from the Investors Diversified Mortgage Corp. (IDS) of Minneapolis.

"We are going to try and make the Plymouth Hilton Inn one of the most complete hotel, convention, food, entertainment and recreational facilities available in the area," said Baker.

Baker, 50, is also president of The Deane Baker Co. with headquarters in Dearborn. He purchased the Inn, however, in his own name, without involvement by his company.

Baker was elected to the University of Michigan Board of Regents by polling more than 1 1/2 million Michigan voters in 1972.

Previously he was appointed by Gov. Milliken to serve on the Grand Valley State College Board of Control.

BAKER GAINED national recognition for his work in industrial park development in Michigan and for converting the Stockyards in Chicago into an industrial park.

He has completed two low-income housing developments — Nagel Plaza and the Martin Luther King Homes — which provide 507 homes for families in Detroit.

Before starting his own business, Baker, over the past 20 years, was vice-president of two major contracting firms and president of a De-

troit-based international contracting firm.

Baker earned a master's degree in business administration from the Harvard Graduate School of Business Administration and has a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Wisconsin.

Smith's tax bill advances

LANSING—A bill to require the state to pay money to local governmental units in lieu of taxes on state land has advanced in the House of Representatives.

Representative Roy Smith (R-Ann Arbor), whose 52nd District includes part of Plymouth, introduced HB 4105 last January. The bill was then referred to the House Taxation Committee.

The bill was recently moved out of the taxation committee and moved to the House Appropriations Committee. Smith expects action on the bill on the floor this fall.

The bill provides that the state will pay an amount equal to 25 per cent of the money that would be due in taxes if the land weren't owned by the state. Recreational lands and facilities would be exempt from this requirement.

The bill also provides that the county treasurer shall apportion this payment to the various cities and townships within the county in proportion to the funds received for the state property located within a city or township.

Real seance can be dangerous

The dictionary defines a seance as "a group of people attempting to make contact with the souls of the dead."

However, the most popular type of home seance seldom, if ever, involves any real spirits. Most often, a group of people sit around a table with their hands on top so that their little fingers touch, and an unbroken chain is formed.

The lights are usually dimmed to make it easier for the participants to concentrate on what they are doing.

If all the members of the group are serious about this, it is quite possible for them to work up energy that fairly crackles and is so electric that it can be felt by others in the room outside of the circle.

OFTEN THE tables rock, rap, tip and actually seem to jump about the room of their own accord. I have seen sessions of this type where the people involved had to stand up, leave their chairs behind, and follow the table to avoid breaking the circle.

Once movement starts, lights can be turned up, people can laugh and talk, and nothing short of breaking the circle seems to stop the action.



This action, however, is not caused by spirits, but by human energies. Although they are not consciously moving the table, the members of the circle are providing that energy and are responsible for the movement.

This is very dramatic and makes an exciting and relatively harmless experiment. However, although it is a psychic experience, it is not a real seance, since no attempt is made to communicate with any ghosts or spirits.

FOR A REAL seance, the room is set up in much the same way, although some groups dispense with a table and simply seat themselves in a circle holding hands.

Again, the lights are dimmed, and this time, instead of concentrating on the table, movement or energies, the participants sit quietly and perhaps chant or sing softly in unison.

This often seems to have a hypnotic effect on them, and they go into a trance-like state in which they some-

times believe they are receiving spiritual messages. Whether or not they are communicating with the dead is not the important factor here, for it can be neither proven nor disproven. What is important is that they believe they are, and this can have a traumatic effect upon an individual.

Please understand that by describing this phenomena, I am not necessarily suggesting that you try it. Let me repeat some important things I have said here before.

FIRST, I DO not believe that you can just decide to call up a ghost and do so. I think any well-adjusted spirit probably has something else to do besides entertaining at your party. How-

ever, if there is one who might have reason to wish to contact you, perchance by making the conditions more favorable, it will be able to do so. Who knows?

Second, no one, who is not in complete control of his senses, should play with this or any other psychic phenomena. If you are drinking, taking any kind of drug or tonic, even if it is prescribed by a doctor, or if you are emotionally unstable at this time, or even over-excitable, I suggest that you sit this one out. It is not for you.

I personally would not recommend such activity for any group unless a well-trained psychologist and a registered nurse are in attendance. Contrary to what others may say, it can be dangerous.

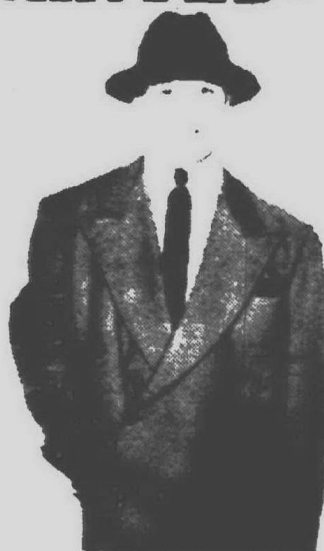

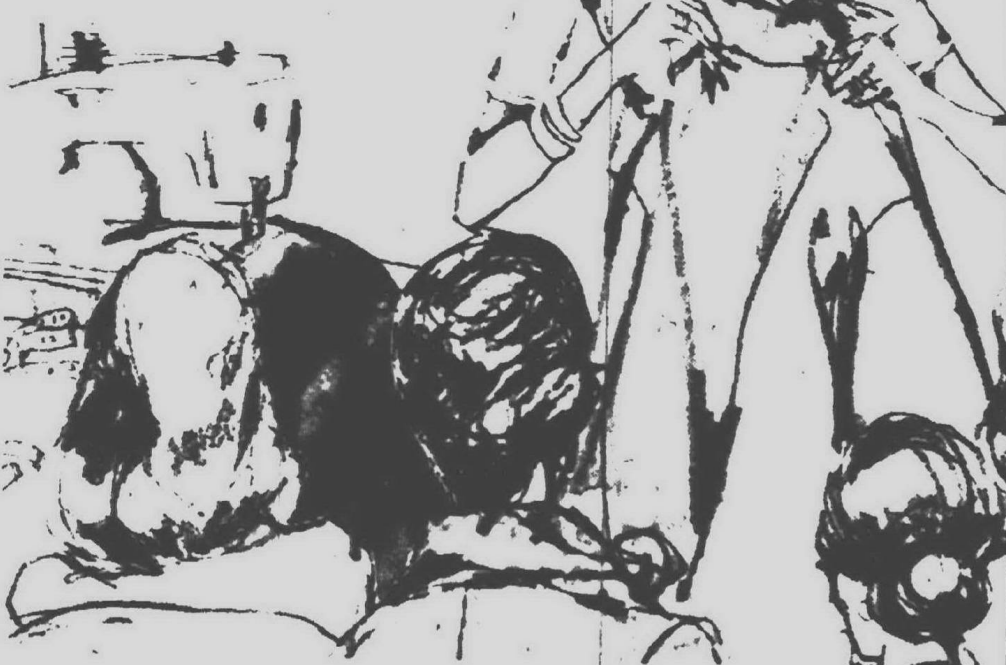

'Nothing else like it' at SC

Is there a subject you'd like to know more about but never took time to explore?

Or couldn't find listed in a college class catalogue?

Or wasn't satisfying as taught under the traditional time formula of 50 minute classes so many days a week?

Well, hike over to Schoolcraft College where a unique program of independent study is offered this fall for the first time.

"There is nothing else like it," said Gordon Wilson who, with his English instructor colleague Sue Kaplan, devised and will direct the course.

"We investigated Wayne State's Monteith College, Michigan State's Justin Morrill and a number of west coast universities which have independent study programs," Wilson said.

"We adopted some of their ideas, altered and improved others and

added some new concepts of our own."

The program, catalogued as Independent Human Studies, offers 14 courses which actually are suggestions or starting points from which the student can move off into his particular interest.

A course in human conflict might branch off to wars between nations, conflict within society, ways the individual handles conflict or economic conflict, or offshoots of any of these, just as an example.

"Even literary narrative is the exploration of some kind of conflict," Ms. Kaplan said.

There are no prerequisites for the course but a brief written application and an interview are necessary for admission.

"We're looking for a diversity of ages and interests," Wilson said.

The age range of those who have applied so far is 18 to 50, he said.

"We want people committed to

working independently but not the typical academic," Wilson added. "We may accept the very scholarly but we will take the vocational, too. We don't want anyone to think of this as an elitist kind of program."

Among interests brought out by early enrollees, Wilson mentioned a young woman attracted to the study of a one-industry town in Northern Michigan dependent on a railroad, and the railroad's impact on the community's way of life.

Another, he said, intends to analyze political campaigns and a woman plans further pursuit of the arts.

Maximum enrollment will be 35 students, 20 during daytime hours and 15 in the evenings.

Registration will be Aug. 26 and 27.

Seminars, small group discussions, presentation and tutorial sessions will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Tuesday and Thursday will be devoted to research and independent study.

Group and tutorial sessions for evening students will be from 7-10 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday.

At the end of the semester, student and instructor will decide how to divide up the 15 hours credit, such as three hours each for English composition, political science and sociology and two hours each for speech and philosophy.

Most transfer institutions will accept the credits, Wilson said.

Day students will select two, and evening students one from among the 14 courses offered this fall.

The courses are: human conflict, love as a human investment, body awareness, human becoming, human recreation, the cycle of living, human maturity, humanity and technology, humans as political citizens, humans as economic creatures, humanity in cultural transmission, the aesthetic impulse, humans as creatures of the universe, and the future of humanity—humanity of the future.

SEMCOC bill poses the right questions

A father may dislike the idea, but he knows that one day his daughter will announce that she plans to enter wedlock, or some modified version thereof. The father knows he will have to accept it because his daughter is grown up.

State Rep. William Ryan has made such an announcement to the 4.8 million parents and non-parents of southeastern Michigan. Ryan (D-De-

troit) has proposed a bill which would recognize that the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOC) has grown up and is ready to take on adult (governmental) responsibilities.

Ryan, a former House speaker, is chairman of that body's urban affairs committee. Even if his bill is scary to some folks, Ryan has the courage — and the clout — to get public hearings on it this fall.

Ryan's idea is hardly original. It's based on

proposals in the "Regionalist Papers," published by Metropolitan Fund, Inc., the fine research and education foundation which begat SEMCOG. New Detroit, the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) and the Transportation and Land Use Study (TALUS).

OTHER STUDY GROUPS, task forces and just plain futurist citizens have come to similar conclusions. Those conclusions are complex and far-reaching, but here is a fair summary:

• SEMCOG's voluntary approach has attracted only about one-fourth of the eligible local governments in the seven-county region. The Metro Fund-Ryan approach would make membership automatic — just like Wayne and Oakland counties are part of the State of Michigan. No more hiding your head in the sand, like non-participating Macomb County does.

• No one has any real control over such truly regional governmental agencies as the Detroit Metropolitan Water Department and the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan (parks) Authority. The Ryan bill would allow SEMCOG to write a charter, subject to state approval, that would make those agencies accountable to someone or something — probably to SEMCOG itself. The most probable form would be that SEMCOG would appoint their board members, review their budgets, perform their planning and coordinate their personnel policies. (No more arbitrary water price hikes.)

• SEMCOG itself doesn't answer to the citizenry. The Ryan bill would set up a 41-member governing body, much like SEMCOG's present executive committee, with 20 members elected by the voters — an eminently sensible idea. Twenty members would be elected from local governments, much the same way the current executive

committee is picked. One member, the chairman, would be elected at large.

A SHAM ARGUMENT against the Metro Fund-Ryan approach is a vague, insecure notion that local home rule will somehow be eroded.

In fact, regional governmental agencies are already here and working. In fact, none of the 400-plus local governments in southeast Michigan is running its own public transportation without regional government help. In fact, only Detroit and a handful of outlying governments have their own water and sewer systems. In fact, a regional agency is already coordinating hospital planning.

Some suburban politicians fear a restructured SEMCOG because direct election of SEMCOG's leadership would open up the "one man, one vote" can of worms. They say suburbs don't fear the present voluntary SEMCOG the way they would fear a more powerful agency.

The answers are plain. First, SEMCOG needs the assured kind of funding a mandatory agency would have (though Ryan's bill would give it no direct taxing authority). Second, the baby has grown up, and it's time she was treated like an adult.

Detroit Mayor Coleman Young is less than enthusiastic about a beefed up SEMCOG. Young's position is that he wants to deal with the governor and the federal administration directly; he alone wants to be Mr. Big in southeast Michigan.

The regional hodge-podge of governance in southeast Michigan has "muddled through," as the British would say, long enough. Ryan's bill, while it may not contain all the final answers, certainly poses the right questions. It deserves cool analysis, refined discussion — not the irrational fear of a daddy who won't let his little girl go out on her first date.

Car companies kill sales

Over the years, the automobile companies have been the marvel of the merchandising world.

Through advertising they created a demand for their products far in excess of an individual's need to have four wheels to take him someplace.

The industry built up snob appeal so that successful people wouldn't be caught dead driving the low-end of the line type of vehicle, even though it was adequate for one's needs. A successful man was marked by the larger automobile he drove.

They built in planned obsolescence, not by making cars fall apart, but by demand. They made you feel guilty if your car was more than two years old because everybody else in the neighborhood was driving a new car.

IN 1972 THEY sold about 10½ million passenger vehicles, which is unheard of in any other nation in the world.

Unfortunately for Detroit, foreign cars entered the market. These cars were sold on reverse snobism. They didn't change their models often. Their ads told people how economical they were and how you could drive one for years and years without having to replace it. The Volkswagen Beetle became the symbol of reverse snobism.

The American automobile industry ignored foreign competition for a while, but the cars made greater and greater inroads until they were taking between 15 and 20 per cent of the market.

I THINK, at that point, the American automobile industry made a mistake and decided to try to meet competition.

People can blame 1974 and 1975 car sales on the energy crisis and the recession. But I think it goes deeper than that.

When the American automobile industry de-

cided to build smaller cars which didn't change radically as often, to save costs, and toned down the announcement hoopla by introducing the cars in the middle of the year, they told the American people they really didn't need to have a new car every year, and therefore they cut the demand they had been so successful in creating.

In the 1975 model year, sales will probably amount to 6½ million passenger cars, a drop of some four million sales.

A GOOD PORTION of this drop in sales is because people have found they can drive their cars three, four and five years and still have a very serviceable product. If this trend continues, then the only way the four-million car loss can be recaptured is by the population increasing.

This does not bode well for the Detroit area's economy, since it is based on successful car sales.

While 1976 will probably be a better car year—because the people who didn't buy in '74 and '75 eventually have to replace their automobiles—we really can't look for many years to come, for great automobile sales years, as in the past.

Somehow, the great marvel of the merchandising world, by altering its methods and meeting competition, became its own worst enemy.

'Jaws'—a classic thriller

In the nearly two years I have written this column, I have never recommended a movie. I will now. Go see "Jaws."

The movie will grab you and shake you and pierce into primitive fears you didn't know you had. It will also keep you out of the ocean for at least three years, and even your swimming pool may seem ominous.

"Jaws" will slam you into your seat. The action is so fast-paced, the cinematography so stunningly real, I doubt that you will once even think of eating popcorn.

The movie is that good.

I sat through it tightly wound, always expecting the unexpected and always startled when it happened.

"Jaws" is a classic thriller, with more power and pace than any movie I have ever seen. If your heart is in good condition, see the movie. It's worth the price of the ticket.

ON TO OTHER things.

I think candy stores, bakeries and ice cream parlors could all increase business if they only hired skinny people. Nothing makes a person shy away from ordering a chocolate sundae faster than seeing a 300-pound man behind the counter.

SO YOU WANT to join the military?

Well, if that's your choice, no one is going to stop you. Especially the government. Just keep one thing in mind.

You see all the posters and hear all the prom-

ises the Army, Navy, Air Force and Marines make concerning career opportunities in the respective branches of the service. Be it pilot or radio repair person, the job opportunity is there. Benefits such as travel, pay, long vacations and educations also exist.

However, the key element that is seldom mentioned is that as a member of the armed forces, your first duty is to fight. When the balloon goes up, you won't necessarily be asked to repair a radar or drive a truck or complete your education. You may be asked to fight and possibly die for your country.

To every seasoned military man, this goes without saying. To someone out of high school, heady with promises of a challenging military career, such a premise may not even enter into the picture.

It should. SPEAKING OF LAWMAKERS, did you ever stop to wonder why we are becoming more and more a country of laws? Well consider this: the primary function of every state and federal representative is to create laws. That's his job.

Of course, he may also repeal laws, but that seldom happens.

So out of our democratic system of government, the proliferation of laws seems nearly inevitable.

ONE FINAL PROTEST. Have you seen the television ads for the new fall shows? Incredible. Some of the ads probably will take up more air time this summer than the show will this fall, if programs are cancelled at the same rate as last year.

An instructive DDT tale

Public television scrambled some myths about DDT in a recent broadcast.

DDT, an insecticide now banned from use in the U.S., has been criticized for being a possible cancer-causing agent and also for harming wildlife.

The program, produced in Boston, artfully examined facts of the DDT controversy. In doing so, it sidetracked a whole nest of issues associated with environmentalism.

The short life of DDT began during World War II, when it was discovered in Switzerland. The chemical saved thousands of lives during the war, lives of both civilians and soldiers.

ITS FIRST use was in Naples, a city clutched by an epidemic of typhus. The use of DDT saved hundreds of thousands of lives and was the first defeat of the disease.

After the war, American farmers began using massive amounts of DDT to improve crop production.

Scientists discovered that DDT takes decades to break down into other compounds. Studies showed the accumulation of DDT made birds lay thin-shelled eggs. Wild bird populations decreased.

Rachel Carson indicted DDT in her book "Silent Spring," the work which spawned the environmental movement.

Environmentalists began compiling evidence supporting banning of DDT. However, shortly before DDT was banned a few years ago, a government panel ruled that DDT could not be proven to be the cause of either human or animal health problems.

The Environmental Protection Agency banned DDT anyway.

IT WAS a political decision, obviously, and in this case a harmless political decision. A spokesman for a chemical company, reportedly the only one in the country which still makes DDT, said other chemicals had already replaced it in use. By the time it was banned, DDT was used in disease prevention overseas.

The banning of DDT might be the first big victory for environmentalists. In cases where evidence is much more damning than in the DDT matter, however, environmentalists have had more trouble winning.

The Reserve Mining controversy is an example. A mining company, apparently polluting Lake Superior with possibly harmful mining wastes, continues to operate in the face of many lawsuits.

THE LEGITIMATE concerns of environmentalism ought not to be ignored, as they were during the first 180 or so years of this country's existence. However, environmental concerns also ought not to automatically overrule any other consideration—such as jobs or national needs for energy.

Environmental considerations can be balanced with other issues. One only need drive the John Lodge freeway toward downtown Detroit to see an example. Only a few years ago, a hazy brown fog would have hung over downtown. Now downtown MURC readings are often the same as those taken in the suburbs.

The reason is that automobile pollution has been curtailed. Automobile pollution controls probably have cost some jobs, but the auto industry has not been destroyed.

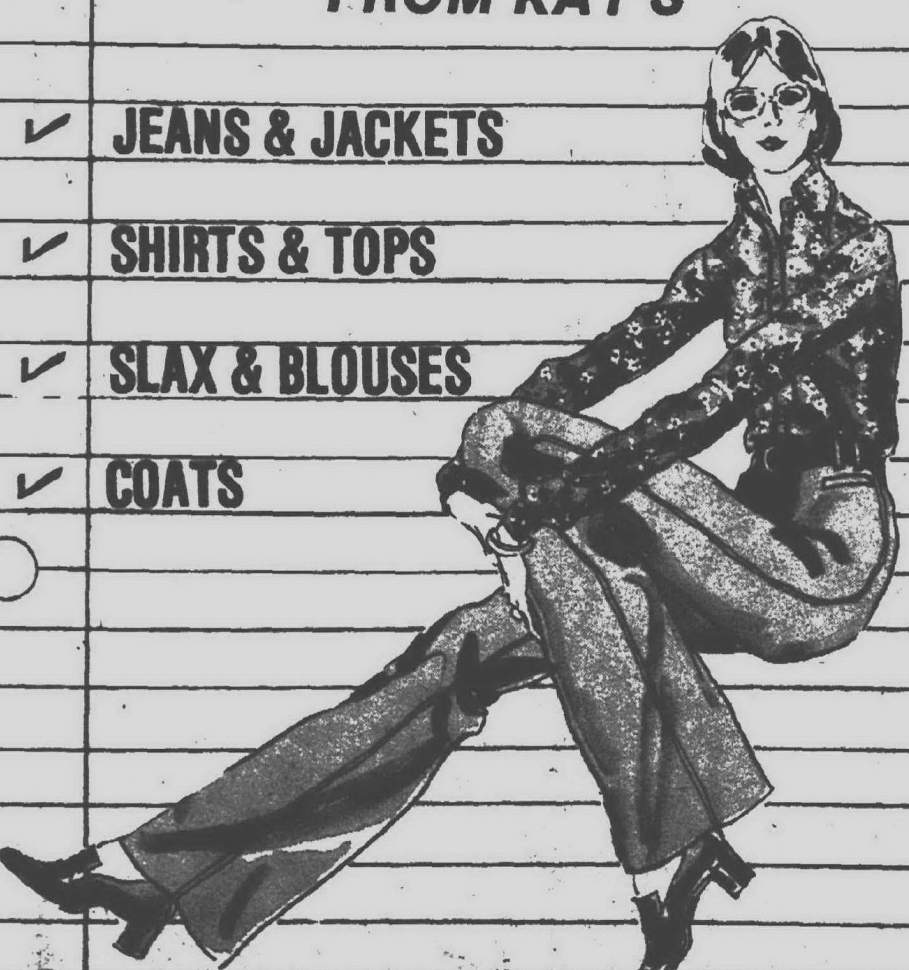

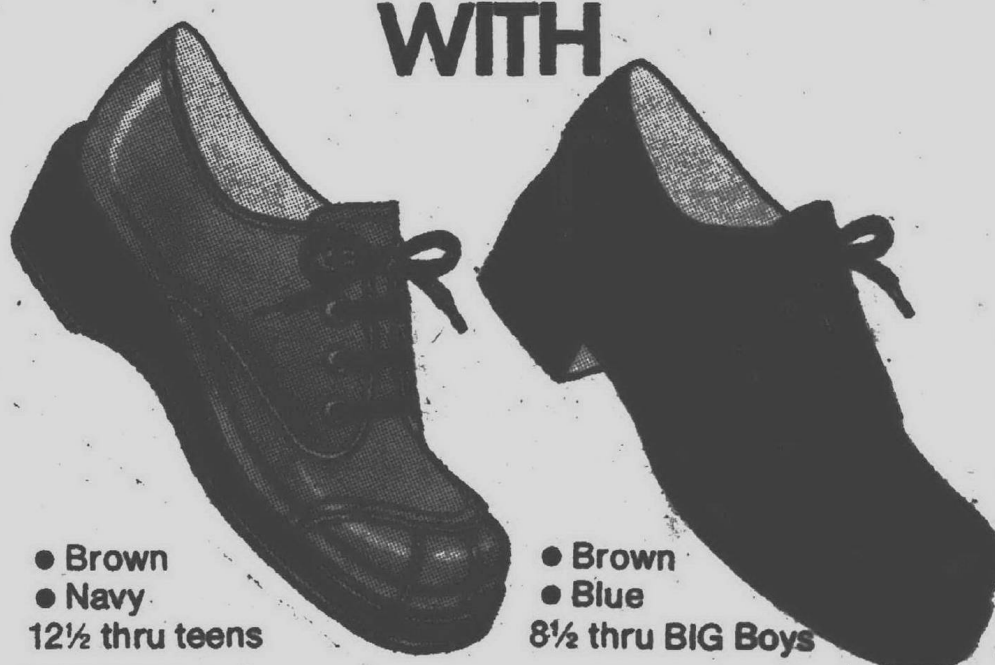

What to do until the mechanic comes

In their march away from stove, washing machine and sink, many women are discovering that to be truly liberated they must master the secrets of the internal combustion engine.

The fear that the motor of their car will die out on the highway, on a vacation trip, or even in their own drive-ways has driven substantial numbers of them into powderpuff mechanics courses offered by schools and Y's in the area.

Aware of the awakening interest on the part of women in such matters as oil pressure, generators and batteries, the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Wayne County Cooperative Extension Service have prepared a series of pamphlets on basic car care for the homemaker.

Designed to be read both before and after the car gives its last whimper and dies, the pamphlets can be regarded as a first step on the road to auto awareness.

"LET'S CONSIDER the gas gauge on your instrument panel," begins Howard J. Doss, Michigan State University agricultural engineering specialist.

The best practice is to drive on the upper half of the gas tank especially

when on a long trip or driving through sparsely settled country.

"Keep it half full or better," says Doss, noting also that "a full tank also helps minimize excessive water condensation."

He also suggests learning the approximate number of miles your car will travel on a gallon of gas. Check the owner's manual for the tank capacity.

Fill the tank and record the mileage. Next time you fill up, subtract miles traveled from point of origin to point of refill. Divide the miles by the number of gallons used between fills, hence, miles per gallon estimate.

If your car runs low on gas during a trip, use your lowest miles-per-gallon estimate to determine about how far you can travel before refilling.

Reducing your speed to 45 or 50 mph can also give you more miles per gallon than you will get traveling at higher speeds.

DOSS WARNS that since occasionally a car may blow a fuse because of an electrical overload or short, you should know how to replace a fuse.

Every car has a fuse panel which functions much like that found in the home. A car's electrical circuit amperage will range from two to 20 amps.

The panel is usually located beneath the dashboard on the firewall near the steering column. You may need a flashlight to locate the panel.

Usually the fuses are small glass cylinders with metal caps on the ends upon which is stamped the amperage rating, Doss explains. A thin wire, which breaks on electrical overload, runs between the caps in the cylinder.

On some cars the fuse panel will have the amperage and the items the fuse services, stamped beside the fuse socket. If you need to replace a fuse be sure to turn off the ignition first.

Pry the burned-out fuse from the panel clips by using a fiber fuse puller or some non-metallic object like an ice cream stick. Replace the blown fuse with one of equal capacity (rated in amperes.)

Check your owner's manual to be sure your replacement fuse is the correct size for your particular vehicle.

Doss advises keeping a box of assorted fuses in the glove compartment. If a new fuse blows upon installation, have the electrical system checked by a mechanic.

OIL PRESSURE is another matter that Doss feels women should understand. He wants them to learn what car instrument panel indicators — red lights, dial or gauges — mean from the standpoint of safety and potential costs.

One of the first things to notice is that when the key is turned on, all the red lights illuminate, just as the engine starts. This indicates they are working and none of the warning lights are burned out. If one is burned out, have the bulb replaced.

If the red warning light marked "oil" goes on while you are on the highway, pull to the shoulder of the

road as quick as possible. Turn off the engine.

The red light comes on because several things could be wrong. There may not be enough oil in the motor. Or it may be a faulty oil pump or a malfunction by the oil indicator light.

Check the oil level in the engine by examining the dip-stick, which is usually found on the side of the engine. In some recreational vehicles the stick will be toward the front of the engine.

Pull the oil dip-stick out (not to be confused with the automatic transmission dip-stick), wipe it clean and reinsert. Pull it back out and read the calibration at the end. If it is very low or no oil trace appears, put in more oil before proceeding.

Under no circumstances should the car be driven if the oil warning light stays on, or if no oil registers on the dip-stick. Without oil pressure, excessive friction and heat quickly builds and it will ruin the engine.

The cost may amount to several hundred dollars.

LOSS OF OIL may occur from the bottom of the engine (oil pan) being punctured by a rock or chunk of ice, or because it was driven over a barrier such as a curb.

It could also be due to leaking gaskets or a loose oil drain plug located at the bottom of the engine.

Possibly, too, the oil pump may be defective. It is the job of the pump to transport oil from the oil pan to the top of the engine where various parts need lubricating.

In some vehicles, the red light indicator has been replaced by an oil pressure gauge. You should get in the habit of checking it frequently as you drive.

Some gauges have actual pressures

calibrated on the dial in pounds per square inch (psi). Normal oil pressure ranges from 20 psi when the engine is idling to 60 psi at highway speed.

Some types of oil pressure gauges provided by automobile manufacturers contain only division marks, with the pointer being near verticle on the dial indicating "normal" oil pressure.

If the gauge goes out of the normal range, you could have trouble. Check the owner's manual to learn what the oil gauge calibrations mean.

DOSS ALSO HAS some suggestions about another red warning light.

When the one marked "GEN" (for generator) or "ALT" (for alternator) shines, it means the car battery is not receiving an adequate electrical charge.

For those cars with alternator or generator gauges, the needle may move toward "D" or a minus symbol to indicate discharging when the engine is stopped or at slow idle.

At fast idle or normal driving speeds, the needle should move toward "C" or a plus symbol to indicate charge.

When the battery is fully charged and the alternator or generator is providing adequate power supply, the needle will be slightly on the "C" or plus side of the center position of the gauge.

If the gauge indicates a continuous moderate to high charge under normal driving conditions, an experienced mechanic should be consulted.

Depending on the age of your battery, you may be able to drive a short distance for the help of a mechanic after the light or gauge has warned of electrical trouble.

DOSS NOTES that the malfunction may be caused by a broken or loose belt running to the alternator or generator from the engine. It may be owing to an electrical defect in the alternator or generator.

It could be because of defective wiring elsewhere in the car, or corrosion between the battery posts and cables.

When the battery fails to receive an adequate charge, it will lose its power reserve rapidly when used, depending on outside temperatures. Batteries lose power much sooner in winter than summer.

Headlights, heater fans, the radio and windshield wipers when run together draw heavily from the battery.

If car electrical power failure occurs, conserve as much electrical energy as possible by shutting off all unnecessary electrical equipment.

Doss warns that headlights will dim rapidly as battery power is drained. As lights dim, the vehicle becomes a traffic hazard.

If you must proceed when the "ALT" or "GEN" warning light is on or the gauge indicates severe discharge, be cautious and find help as quickly as possible.

Auto mechanics for men and women will also be included in the regular Wednesday family recreation evening at the Grand River Baptist Church, 34500 Six Mile Road, Livonia.

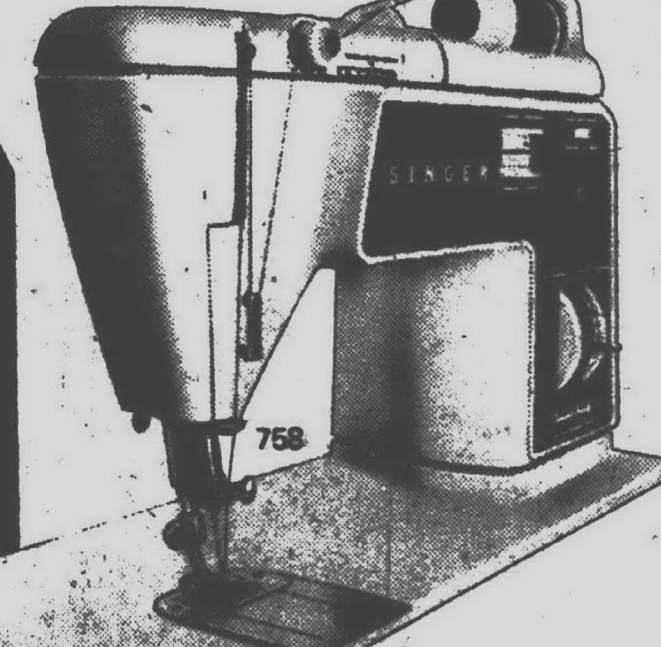

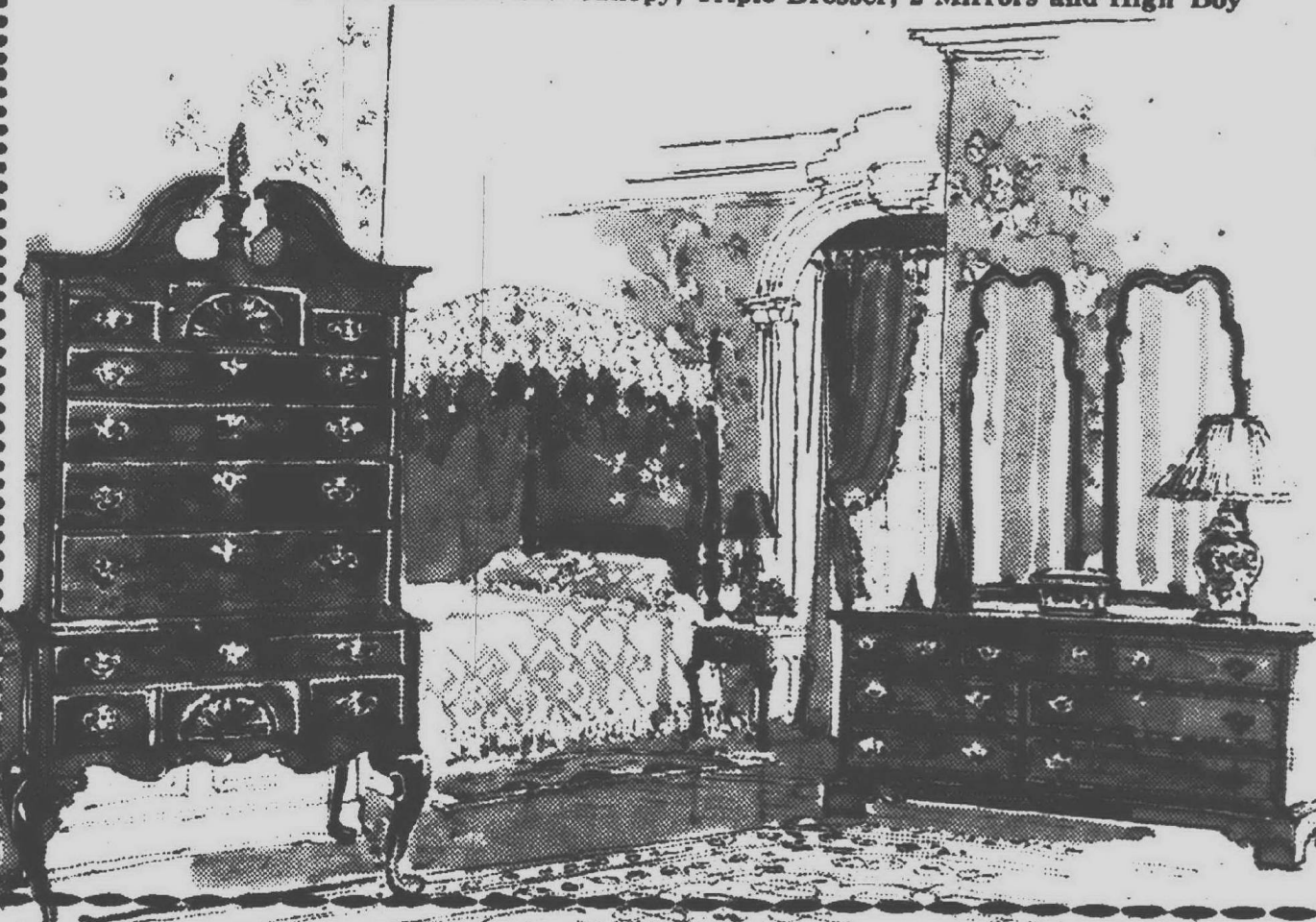

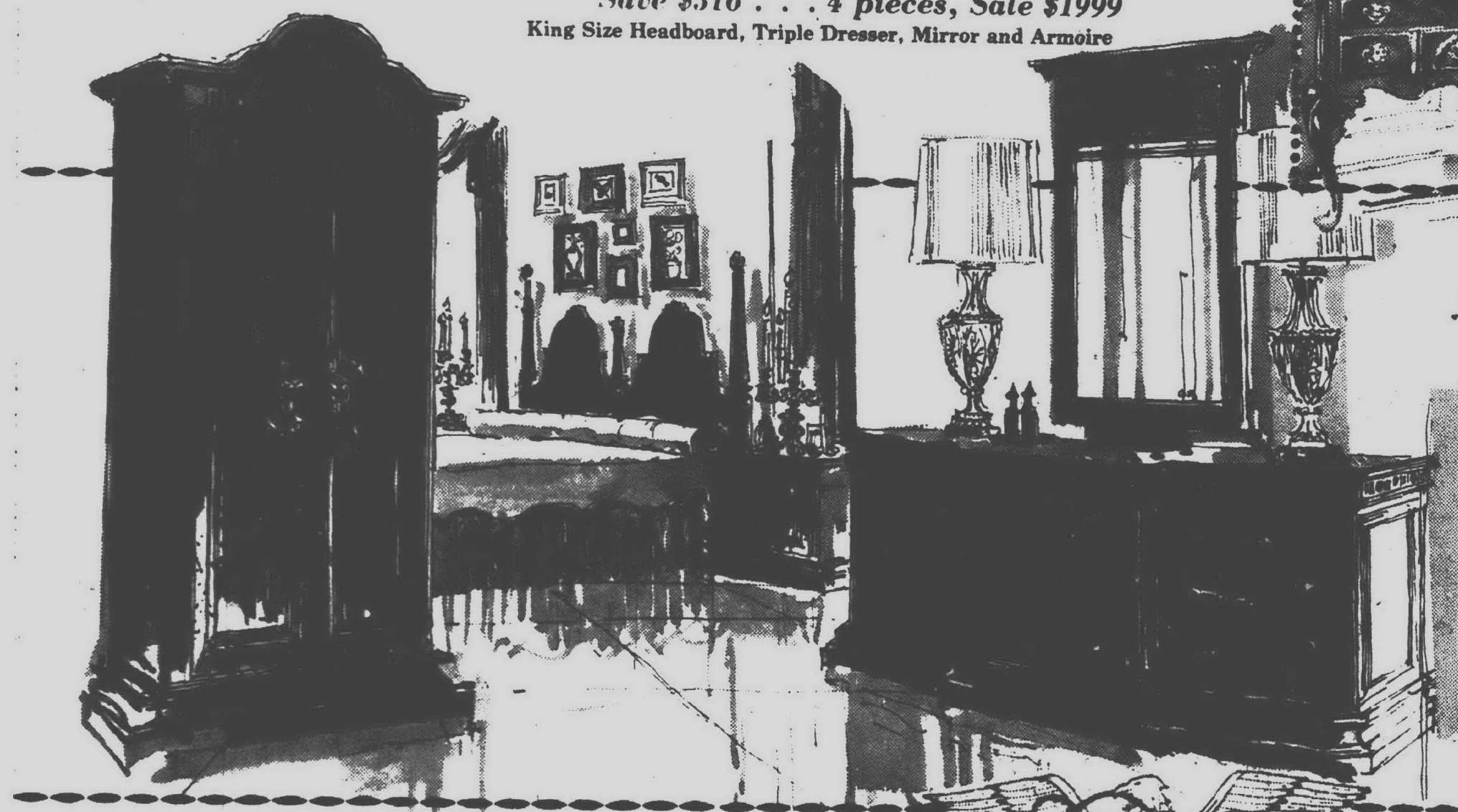

Easter Seals offers safety tips

"Perhaps the single most effective step auto travellers can take for safety is to use seat belts and harnesses every time they are in a moving car," says the Easter Seals Society.

Offering safety tips to prevent crippling accidents, the society adds that 8-10,000 lives could be saved each year if every motorist used safety belts all the time.

Safety precautions could prevent some 450 traffic deaths and 21,000 disabling injuries that usually occur over a three-day summer weekend.

Studies reported by a national safety council show that drinking is a

factor in at least half of fatal motor vehicle accidents over holiday weekends, and that in three out of 10 fatal accidents, vehicles were being driven too fast.

The society suggests that besides an overall garage inspection for possible problem areas, a quick check of the car just before starting and periodically during a trip can ensure peace of mind and greater security.

Check tires for inflation and road damage. Also check lights, windshield, windows, horn, mirrors for proper adjustment, steering for any excessive play, and brakes for at least one-inch pedal clearance from floor.

Observe to see if there is an adequate gas and oil supply and emergency equipment such as a first-aid kit, fire extinguisher and reflectors or flares.

The society also advises avoiding fatigue and distraction. Break up long stretches with a brisk walk, a short nap or a cup of coffee.

The driver should not have to supervise children's activities from behind the wheel. Driving is less nerve-racking if children are occupied with toys and books.

Drivers should also recognize the need for reducing speed for heavy

traffic, weather or poor road conditions and at night.

Drive defensively, and be ready for the unpredictable or dangerous actions of others.

Women and work will be U-M study

Community groups interested in how women's jobs can be made more fulfilling and other issues concerning women and work, may have a chance to take part in a new research project.

Under a grant recently awarded the University of Michigan Women's Studies program, a 15-month project is being designed to illuminate the concerns of working women via a series of discussion groups throughout the state, according to Caren J. Deming, project coordinator.

"Work" encompasses homemaking and volunteerism as well as the entire spectrum of paid occupations, says Ms. Deming.

In particular, the researchers will examine the changing roles of women working at various stages of life and the ways that such needs as education and childrearing can best be integrated with a career.

THE DISCUSSIONS will be triggered by two videotapes which are being produced by Kim Beaman, award-winning free-lance video and film producer, and Lydia Kleiner, media consultant for the Women's Studies program and a doctoral student at the U-M.

"Tapes will be biographical portrayals of women in the context of their working lives," Ms. Kleiner said. "The viewers will have an opportunity to relate to the tapes in terms of their own experiences and to react to the issues they raise."

Five U-M faculty members will lead the discussions at meetings of service, business and labor organizations in communities throughout Michigan. They are Robin M. Jacoby, Elizabeth H. Pleck, Leslie W. Tentler and Marilyn B. Young, all of the history department, and Patricia D. Sharpe of the English department.

PROJECT DIRECTOR is Prof. Margaret A. Lourie, director of the U-M Women's Studies program. Joyce L. Kornbluh of the Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations and Joseph H. Pleck, visiting lecturer in psychology, are academic consultants.

World's food shortage should be faced now

"When you woke up this morning, there were 210,000 new mouths waiting for breakfast. That's the daily increment of persons needing to be fed; 75 million new persons a year, a billion more by 1985."

These are words of David M. Stowe, executive vice-president of the United Church Board for World Ministries, at our recent conference annual meeting.

Dr. Stowe is executive of our board concerned with work of the United Church overseas—missionaries, doctors, food and clothing distribution, disaster relief, education—a huge work done in our name.

He receives reports from UCC personnel around the world. He knows what is happening.

HE SPOKE of the two largest nations on earth in terms of population.

"The most populous society on earth, the Chinese, with more than 800 million people on a land area comparable to the 48 United States, is now feeding itself with no visible difficulty," he said.

"Contrast that with India, the second most populous society, nearly 550 million people, with widespread malnutrition and many deaths by starvation year after year.

"And yet, India raises as much food per capita as China does. Obviously a major part of the food problem is distribution rather than total supply."

To summarize, Dr. Stowe suggested four ways in which the food population crisis can be met. First, by much improved distribution of present food production. Second, by lowering waste and making more efficient use of present foodstuffs.

Third, by increased production, which is possible in many parts of the

world (we cannot feed the world, but the world could feed itself). Fourth, by lowering the growing population of the world.

WE CAN AGREE with these four areas of concern which point toward a solution. The problem is how. Dr. Stowe used Bristol-Myers as an example of corporate food waste. "One of the greatest forms of waste

is the waste of human milk. A dangerous prejudice against breast feeding is spreading throughout much of the hungry world, the developing world.

"The baby bottle has become one of the major status symbols of progress and urbanization and liberation. These ideas didn't develop without help of some clever high-pressure salesmanship by infant formula manufac-

urers in our own country and Europe."

Now I have a quarrel with David Stowe. Toward the end of his address he stated, "We can feed the present population of the world."

"We can probably feed double the present population of the world, but we certainly can't feed four times or eight times the population of the world today."

"The basic problem is that population grows not arithmetically but geometrically. It took two million years to get our first billion human beings; 80 years to get the next billion; only 30 to get the next billion; 15 to get the next billion—that's about where we are now. It will take only 12 years before another billion arrives, and before long it will be a billion new people every year."

I have no quarrel with the church doing everything it can to help people of the world gain adequate food.

Surely this is humanitarian work that we want to support.

But if we do not massively face the population problem right now, food for the world is a lost cause—and soon.

DR. STOWE suggested two ways in which the population growth can be slowed.

He stated that people must have a good reason for not having so many children. In the third world there are compelling reasons for having large families.

Secondly women have to have good alternatives to child bearing as a means to achieve identity and find meaning for their existence. Women's Liberation, world-wide, is the need.

But how do we reach these two goals? Look at the struggle for the rights of women in our "advanced" society. There we are. Who will face these difficult problems and seek realistic solutions? Think about that one.

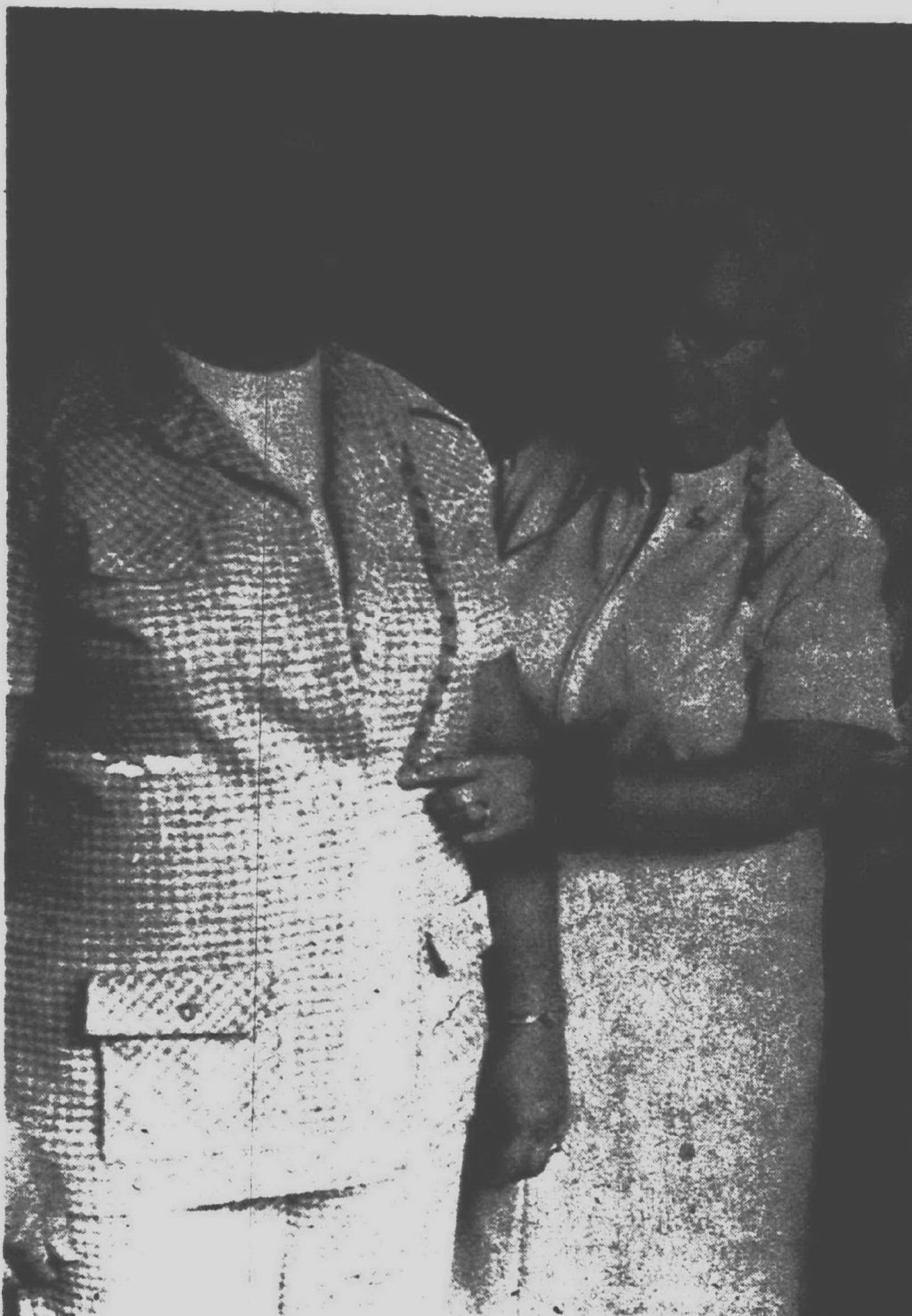

Sewing is long-neglected craft

"When I begin a sewing project, I aim to do it nicely and well," says Mrs. Evelyn Ankorn of Livonia who will begin teaching a class in alteration techniques this fall at Grand River Baptist Church, Livonia.

"It's pleasant delightful work, and I have a picture in my mind of what I am working toward."

Mrs. Ankorn's class will be one of three classes offered by the church during its regular Wednesday family evening program.

The activities include a family dinner at 6:15 p.m., then Bible study classes and later, such courses as knitting, car maintenance, and Mrs. Ankorn's course in clothes alteration.

MRS. ANKORN was a natural choice for the job. A member of the

church for 47 years, she spent 40 years of her life working in garment alteration.

Do you want to know how much she enjoyed it?

"I'll tell you how much I enjoyed it," she says. "I went to work at J.L. Hudson with the idea of spending three months there."

Somehow this extended itself to 40 challenging years, with Mrs. Ankorn often being asked by wives of Hudson executives to work on their clothes. Frequently she was driven to their homes in chauffeured limousines.

DESPITE the fact she loved her profession, it was not her first choice. She yearned to apprentice in a millinery shop.

"They were so attractive and elegant. They were lovely to go into and they made a profound impression on me."

"At that time, decisions were made for girls. However, the fact that I was directed into another channel proved to be the best thing after all. Millinery shops faded."

"Sewing is of extreme importance today," she says. "Like many other crafts, it has been neglected. There has been stress on formal education, which is not for everyone. However, every woman should have enough knowledge to repair and maintain her own wardrobe."

"I've taken care of people who took pride in the fact that they didn't know how to sew on a button. They came all the way downtown to have a button sewn on."

"I told them it was their own fault."

THE THINKING behind her class, she explains, is that since most women today buy ready-to-wear garments,

they ought to learn something about fitting clothing.

"Clothing mustn't show strain in various parts," says Mrs. Ankorn. "So we will discuss how best to alter it."

During the same three month session as Mrs. Ankorn's class, courses in beginning and advanced knitting will be taught by Mrs. Merle Brimhall and Mrs. Pete Middleditch.

General car maintenance will be taught by Bill Dotson, an engineer for American Motors Corp.

In the future, the church is planning Wednesday family night courses in photography, flower arranging, candle-making and needlepoint.

promise of three or four teams being in the battle for the championship.

In recent years the Stroh combination, paced by Mike Totsky, has dominated the scene. Long before a single ball was rolled, Stroh was considered the team to beat.

Things give promise of being different this year and at least three teams—Dale Sevoy's K&S squad, and the Goebel line-up out together by Tom Mc Kay, executive secretary of the Greater Detroit Bowling Association—are expected to fight it out all the way.

In what we now refer to as the "old days", back in the 30s and 40s, there were several teams in the thick of it with Stroh and even personal rivalries held much of the attention.

This was especially true in the case of Joe Norris, the Stroh captain, and Johnny Crimmins, the anchor man on Bob Thynne's Paris Cleaners team. Others among the top challengers included the Fife Electric team captained by Louie Burr. Prior to bowling for Fife this combination won the state title under the banner of Deluxe Tool and Die.

In this group, too, was Ellis Walker's Wilson Dairy team and the Pepsi

Cola club captained by Cass Schlaff. Later, there was Lou Sioff and the Pfeiffer and the E&B teams.

Over the years, Stroh has outlasted its rivals until this season and there promises to be some interesting nights before the titles are decided.

It is much the same in the women's leagues. In the "old days" the Olympic team, captained by Clara Allen, dominated the Detroit scene. Three members of the team are enshrined in the Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame. They are Clara, Stella Hartrick and the late Louise Stockdale.

During the Olympics' reign, the chief challengers were the late "Eddie" Coy's Colonial Broach team and Agnes Ekstrom's Gears by Enterprise that went on to win national acclaim.

Mrs. Ekstrom, considered one of the best spare bowlers in the country, is now president of the Detroit Woman's Bowling Association and an honoree in the Hall of Fame.

In recent years, Anita Cantaline's Jac-Ro team, with Elvira Toepfer, set the pace for the women. Then along came the Motown Record combination, Detroit Bowling Sales with Ann Setlock, and Dolly Auch's "Pinky" Team to battle for honors. And it will be these same four teams favored to fight it out again for the title.

leads the field in the Columbia Open at Hartfield Lanes, in Berkley.

The pitching film includes appearances by some of baseball's top pitchers, such as Jim Hunter, Tom Seaver,

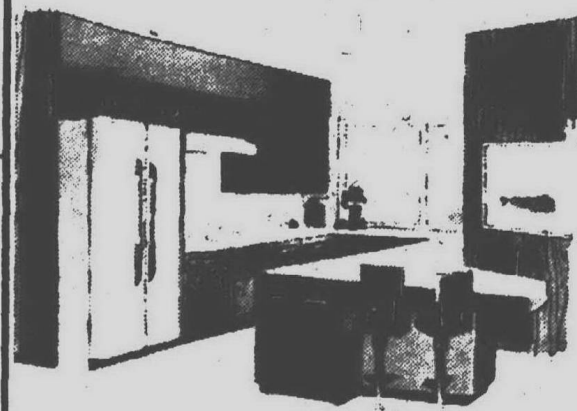
Bob Gibson, Tug McGraw, Mike Marshall, Claude Osteen, Nolan Ryan and Bert Blyleven.

Theater plans comedy, drama, music in '75-76

Although the Theater Guild of Livonia-Redford hasn't staged any productions this summer, members haven't been on vacation. The newly elected board of directors has been busy selecting plays, choosing directors and making plans for the upcoming season. Members feel they have an fresh and varied schedule of entertainment.

The 1975-76 season opens Oct. 10 with the comedy thriller "Sleuth," by Anthony Shaffer. Performances are scheduled Oct. 11, 17, 18, 19, 24 and 25. "Man with a Load of Mischief," an imaginative off-Broadway musical tale of romance and intrigue set in a wayside inn in 19th century England, is the guild's November and December offering.

A sudden accident to a coach and a gallant rescue bring to the inn four adventurous people—a lovely lady and her maid, and a dashing lord and his

manservant. The stage is set for romance, something the innkeeper and his wife are eager to promote so that these guests will stay longer.

Performances are slated the last two weekends of November and the first weekend of December.

The season drama will be "The Rope Dancers." This first play by Morton Wishengrad won the respect and praise of New York critics when it was presented with a cast featuring Siobhan McKenna, Art Carney and Joan Blondell.

In soaring and poetic language, it tells the story of an Irish-American couple at the turn of the century caught up in a maelstrom of repressions and guilt. Performances are the last two weekends in February and the first weekend in March.

"Bus Stop," by William Inge, is the theater's classic comedy presentation for 1975-76. A bus out of Kansas City

is stranded at a roadside cafe in a blinding snowstorm. An overnight scrap ensues between a spangled nightclub singer and the headstrong cowboy who has kidnapped her. Performances are slated in April and May.

Departing from its traditional scheduling, the guild plans to offer it children's show in the summer, traveling from park to park and school auditoriums.

Active and subscription membership tickets are now available. There will be discount of \$1 per person on memberships purchased by Sept. 12. This will provide a savings of 45 percent to season ticket holders.

Because of limited seating in the guild playhouse, 15138 Beech Daly, Redford Township, a new reservation system is being instituted this season. It will be possible to reserve seats for the entire season. This is the same

procedure used by the Fisher Theater in Detroit for season ticket holders.

Other directors include business, Jean Schirmer of Detroit; costumes, Emma Saley of Livonia; membership, Betty Kenney of Birmingham; tickets, Pam Nelson of Westland; prompter, Mary O'Connell of Livonia, and publicity, Judy Pierson of Livonia.

The theater group was organized in

1954 and has since offered more than 80 productions. It also awards nominal scholarships to Redford and Livonia high school graduates pursuing a theater major in college. The guild

has captured top honors in every local and state competition in which it has participated. It is non-profit and self-sustaining but needs community support.

Parade launches 1975 state fair Aug. 22

The 1975 Michigan State Fair opens Friday, Aug. 22 with a 125-unit parade through downtown Detroit. The parade will feature some 30 bands, dozens of floats, beauty queens, drill teams and marchers, clowns, horses, fire engines and the bicentennial Conastoga wagon.

The parade begins at 11 a.m. at Woodward Avenue and the Fisher Freeway and will progress south down Woodward to Fort Street. Deano Day of radio station WDEE will be parade marshal.

Following the two-hour long parade, the official ribbon-cutting ceremony will be at 1 p.m. at the Woodward gate on the fairgrounds. Gov. William G. Milliken, Detroit Mayor Coleman Young and state legislators have been invited to join the Michigan Department of Agriculture and state fair officials in opening day festivities.

Other opening day activities include a 700-foot-long high wire walk by Karl Wallenda, the 70-year-old patriarch of wirewalkers; jazz-rock group Blood, Sweat & Tears performing free in the music shell at 4:30 and 8:30 p.m. and the American Thrill show featuring the 360-degree suicide jump.

Tickets for the thrill show are \$1 for afternoon and \$2 for evening performances. All ticketholders will be eligible for prizes awarded after the last thrill show Sunday, Aug. 31.

The fair program also features daily exhibits of the best of Michigan's livestock and agricultural products, two midways including a 10-act circus in the kiddieland area with shows at 1, 4 and 7 p.m. Circus admission is 50 cents for youngsters and \$1 for adults.

Bubble gum blowers, pie eaters, egg tossers and frisbee throwers will get a chance to display their talents in the daily schedule of all children's contests. Contests are open to youngsters age three through 12 accompanied by a parent. Registration takes place daily from 10 to 10:45 a.m. in the coliseum grove. Competition includes Saturday, Aug. 23 most

freckles contest; Sunday, Aug. 24 pie eating contest; Monday, Aug. 25 peanut race; Tuesday, Aug. 26 egg toss; Wednesday, Aug. 27 largest afro and longest ponytail contests; Thursday, Aug. 28 look alike twin and bubble gum blowing contests; Friday, Aug. 29 balloon blowing and balloon race; Saturday, Aug. 30 burlap derby; Sunday, Aug. 31 crab race, and Monday, Sept. 1 football throwing and frisbee contests.

A special day for senior citizens complete with contests, dancing, give-

aways and refreshments is slated Aug. 26. All persons 62 years and older will be admitted free to the fair until 3 p.m. Activities and information designed for senior citizens will be available all day in the tree-shaded coliseum grove.

In the morning, orange juice, donuts and magazines will be provided for seniors free. Agencies dealing with Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security and food stamps will be on hand to answer questions. There also will be an arts and crafts display with per-

sons available to answer handicraft questions. Among the day's contests are oldest man and woman, baldest head, most grandchildren, longest married couples and queen of the old-timers.

The fair also offers free entertainment daily at the music shell. Groups featured include Tanya Tucker Aug. 23, Pat Boone & Family Aug. 24, The Sheffields and Share Aug. 25-26, Ben E. King Aug. 30 and The Captain & Tennille Aug. 31-Sept. 1.

In the grandstand the Osmond Fam-

ily will perform Aug. 26 and 27, Al Green Aug. 28, and Bobby Vinton Aug. 30.

Tickets are available at all Hudson's and Grinnell's stores as well as the state fair ticket office under the grandstand. Tickets are \$4 and \$6. Admission to the fairgrounds is extra.

Fair gates open at 8 a.m. daily and close at 10 p.m. Admission is \$2 for persons over 12; 50 cents for youngsters eight to 11, and children under eight are admitted free. Parking is \$1.50.

On to college

Plymouth's Jeff Roth concludes jr. career

Michigan lost one of its most promising young golfers last week when Jeff Roth left to begin his freshman year at the University of Arizona.

The loss may not be permanent. Roth, a 17-year-old Plymouth-Salem High School graduate who plays out of Farmington Country Club, may return to area links for tournaments during his summer vacations.

Roth will turn 18 next month, and that birthday will bring an end to a brilliant junior tournament career. Seventeen is the top age for junior tournament players.

Roth played in his last junior tourney two days before leaving for Tuscon and the University of Arizona. That was the State Junior Tournament at Port Huron, and Roth was leading when it was called because of rain. Roth won the tourney in 1973 and finished second last year.

In this year's tourney, he shot a disappointing 77, but then picked up four strokes to take the lead when play was called.

Two weeks ago Roth was in Nashville, Tenn. for the U.S. Junior championships. He qualified for match play, but was finally beaten by the tournament champion. He was the junior district champion this year and last. He also played in the 1974 Michigan Open and made the cut.

"I HAVEN'T PLAYED in as many national tournaments as I would have liked," Roth said. "I played in the North and South Amateur this spring at Pinehurst, N.C. I qualified for match play and felt pretty good about that."

"The International Junior Tournament at Coral Gables, Fla. last December was a really good tournament for me. I had an 80 on the first round, but was low on the last three with a 72, 70 and 71. That brought me up to ninth place. The greens gave me trouble in the first round, but I had them figured out by the next day."

Roth has crammed a lot of golf into his summers since first playing on a par-three course at Wauwatosa, Wisc. at the age of eight.

"I didn't like golf that much when I was little," he said. "My dad watched it on TV, but I thought it was boring. Dad had a set of clubs and we went out to play. I think it cost 25 cents for nine holes."

"Then pretty soon we had about 20 kids who liked to play. We'd ride our bikes with our clubs on our shoulders, and we'd play before and after school every day. The kids, mostly fourth, fifth and sixth graders, came out in herds to play."

Roth's family moved to Plymouth six years ago, and Jeff continued to improve his game. He captained Plymouth-Salem's golf team for the past two years leading the Rocks to two regional and Suburban Eight league titles, as well as the State Class A championship in his junior year.

Mental discipline is an important part of Roth's game. The ability to figure and think things through while playing is one of the qualities which separates the would-bes from the tournament champs, he said.

"SEE, GOLF IS more mental than physical. Anybody with a good build can hit the ball."

"But if a golfer doesn't have it upstairs—if he starts yelling, throws his clubs, gets down on himself—then he's not going to score well."

Roth is a golf fan as well as a player. His favorite is Jack Nicklaus. During the recent Police Athletic League (PAL) Tournament at Wabek, he followed Lee Trevino and Johnny Miller and caught J.C. Snead whenever possible.

"They were exciting players to watch," Roth said.

As he talked about his tournaments and his scores, Roth said that he must have sounded rather boastful. He said that he didn't want to leave that impression. It's just that he likes to play and he likes to play well.

Roth plans to major in business administration while at the University of Arizona on a golf scholarship.

"If I'm good enough, I'd like to turn pro someday," he said. "But that's a long way away."

John Bolland and Kevin Smith combined for the win in the Philadelphia game, limiting the Keystone State entrant to only four hits.

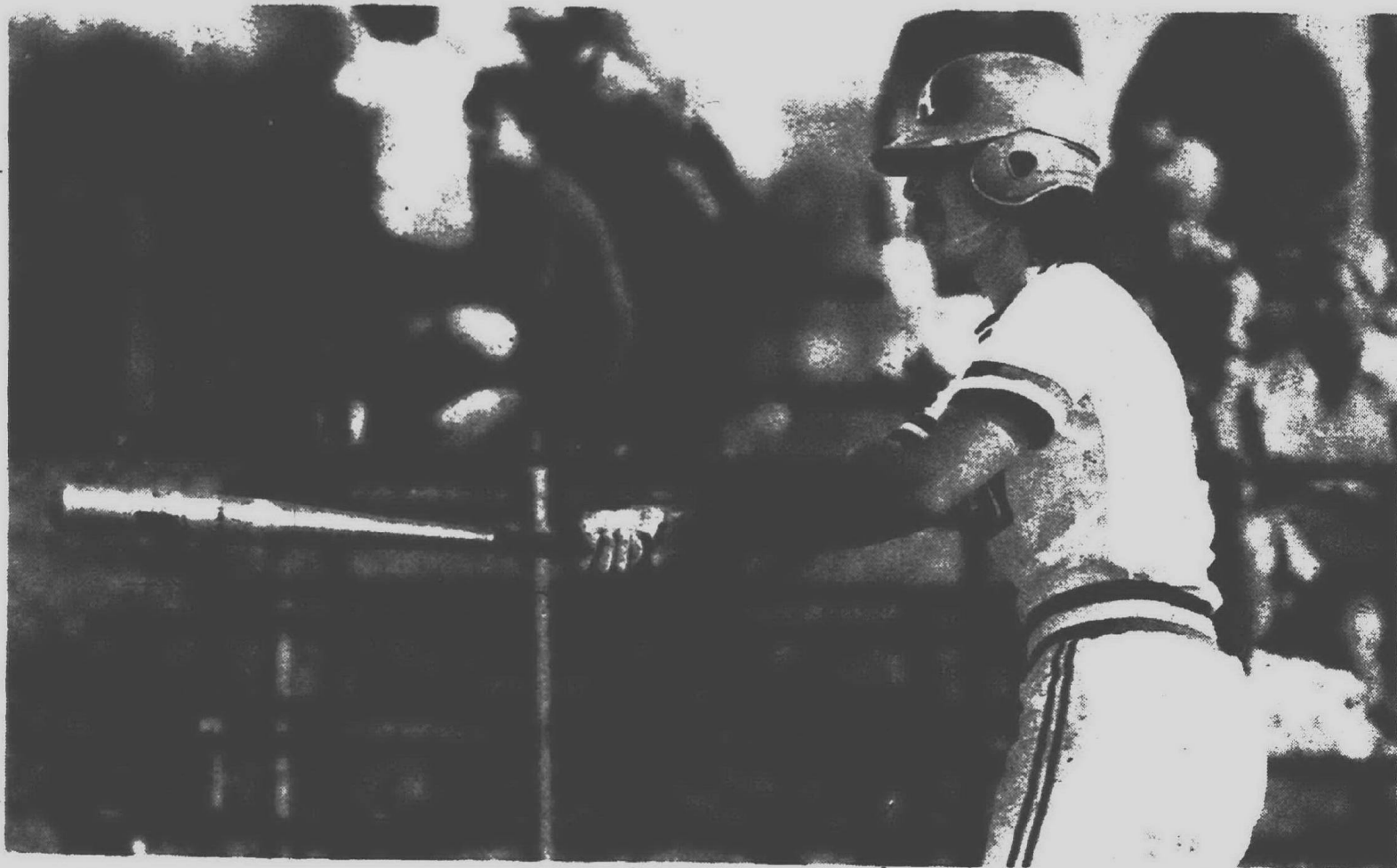
Redford picked up a run in the sec-

Irony in new Wolverine mark

All's well that ends well, or what a difference a day makes. The latest example of those old truisms being Wolverine Raceway's newest driving ace Shelly Goudreau.

The 27-year-old Canadian teamster pulled the four-year-old pacer Baron Mave to the outside at the head of the stretch last Saturday and blazed to the finish wire in the new all-time track record time of 1:57.1. But for the young Goudreau it all wasn't as easy as it sounds.

Just the Saturday before Goudreau had also seemed to be heading down the home stretch to a new track mark. He was neck and neck with the Chicago invader Rambling Willie when suddenly his pacer, Grover C, veered sharply toward the rail and his opponent. Twice Grover C pulled the

stunt, obviously impeding the race progress of the other horse, and although he finished first he was almost immediately disqualified by the judges.

Down the drain, too, went what would have been a Wolverine Mile record of 1:57.3. Even though he has already established himself as one of the finest young driving prospects in the country, Goudreau was clearly despondent over the incident.

"Grover C has had a few aches and pains and I guess he just got to hurting," Shelly said. "I couldn't hold him and we blew the whole thing."

Actually this past Saturday night didn't seem to be starting out much better for Goudreau. It wasn't the Wolverine feature race, but Shelly found himself and the rather unheralded

Baron Mave in with a real gang of pacing wildcats. There were Tiger Jet, Springs Pride, Dancing Knox, Peter Lobell and Ickawowie, and his was the only horse that had never won in 2-minutes or less.

The looks of things didn't improve much when the head check on Baron Mave's harness popped loose behind the starting gate and forced a recall of the race start.

"I simply couldn't believe it, either, when he threw the shoe on his right

front foot leaving the gate the second time," Goudreau relates. "There we were in last place and racing with three shoes."

The race became so hotly contested that Peter Lobell, Tiger Jet and Dancing Knox had all taken turns with the lead by the time the three-quarters mark was reached. A brand new track record was also obviously in store with the timer board flashing quarter mile fractions of :29.1, :59-flat and 1:27.4. And Goudreau and Baron Mave were still trailing the field.

Livonia's Whispering Willows Golf Course, site of next month's seventh annual Observer & Eccentric Open Golf Tournament, is a showcase in deception.

"The course isn't that long, but it's tight," assistant Whispering Willows pro Tom Shelton said Monday.

The 6,400-yard course at Newburgh and Eight Mile is presently in its best condition ever and that means plenty of trouble for golfers who don't slam the little white ball arrow straight.

Bedecked with trees seemingly everywhere, the par-71 course can prove a nightmare for those with a propensity to hook or slice even the slightest bit.

"That's what gets golfers in trouble the most. There's a lot of wood out there," Shelton said.

Water also can be a problem. The course has five holes with water.

Construction recently was completed on the 14th and 18th holes making them tougher than ever but the entire course will get a facelift for the Sept. 13 and 14 men's tournament and Sept. 18 women's competition.

"We'll let the rough grow a lot thicker and shape the fairways more. Also we'll cut the greens very short to make them fast," Shelton said.

The Livonia municipal course is one of the busiest in the entire state. Last month, for example, it averaged 384 players daily and hit a one-day high of 521. In spite of this, the tees, fairways and greens remain in very good shape and the expected 200 golfers for the O&E tourney should face a formidable task hitting par.

"Considering the amount of people who use the course, it's in excellent shape. A lot of credit is due to our groundskeeper Jim Trenner who has been the head man in that department for all eight years that the course has operated," said Shelton.

As an assistant pro, Shelton gets on the course regularly and has hit a personal best of one-under 70 there.

That mark is far off the course record of 65 set by touring Canadian pro Bill Wakem four years ago. But according to Shelton, not many golfers play scratch golf on the course.

Last year, for example, a two-over 144 was good enough for top prize in the championship flight of the four-flight men's tourney. That score was hit by Farmington's Bill Curtis.

"There are several tough holes on the course. Probably the two toughest are the back-to-back par four 11th and 12th holes. It takes a real good golfer to get through those two in eight," said Shelton.

If past years are any indication, there'll be several golfers in this year's largest field who'll be shooting not only those two holes, but the whole course, at or near par.

Plymouth boosts 1st female justice of peace in Michigan

(Part 1)

The best-known woman in Plymouth in the 1920s was a tall, majestic, white-haired housewife and mother of twins, Mrs. Phoebe Patterson.

Mrs. Patterson, the first woman justice of the peace in Michigan, received statewide notice in 1920. In that year, she was the key figure in a Detroit court case in which her right, as a woman, to hold office was challenged.

During the case, it was contended that a woman's services, thoughts and actions were the property of her spouse, and that Judge Patterson's husband, therefore, had a legal right to exercise a coercive influence over her.

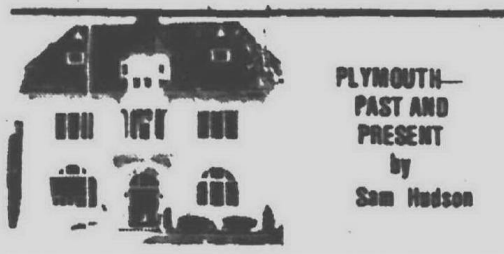
Not that Mrs. Patterson's husband harbored such male chauvinistic thoughts. The suit was started by a Detroit lawyer, piqued because he had to plead, before a woman judge, a case which he lost.

THE DAUGHTER of Narcis and Margaret Ely, "Phoebe," as she was widely known in Plymouth, was born in neighboring Superior Township and educated in the public schools there.

In 1873, at age 16, she moved to Ypsilanti, where she opened a dressmaking shop. In 1878, she married Melvin A. Patterson, a native of Plymouth, whose family had lived here for many years.

Mr. Patterson, who worked at the Hamilton Rifle Co., a short distance from his home, died in 1921, two years after his wife was elected to office. She survived him by 10 years. The Pattersons had three children—twins, Clara and Clarence, and a son who died at an early age, Clara Patterson (Mrs. Arthur Todd) was the girl whose remembrances of the Plymouth Fair are reported in another chapter.

Mrs. Patterson was elected justice of the peace in April, 1919, at the age of 62. She was the first of her sex to hold the office. A staunch Republican, and a fighter for the rights of women, she had attended a political caucus with a couple of friends shortly before women got the right to vote. A friend



of hers, a doctor, rose at the meeting and nominated her for the position. Surprised, she demurred, but was nominated and subsequently elected.

"She never was in a court room until she ran for office," the Detroit Free Press reported on Sept. 15, 1920. "Then she came to Detroit and spent a half-day listening to the city judges. That showed her the trick, she says. She also had assimilated a lot of valuable points, she believes, by reading cases reported in the newspapers. Only last week she nicked a county highway commissioner \$10 for speeding."

MRS. PATTERSON may have had little experience in judicial matters, but she learned quickly.

During her 12 years on the bench she earned the confidence of county authorities who praised her efficiency and judgment. Reportedly, there was "no justice of the peace in Wayne County in which the prosecutor's office placed greater confidence," than Phoebe Patterson.

In 1927, eight years after she became justice of the peace, a newspaper reported that during her time on the bench she had heard 1,009 county criminal cases, from serious to minor in nature, had conducted 17 coroners' inquests, and had officiated at 11 marriages.

Her capacity for work was prodigious. The Plymouth Mail declared that she was the most active of the four justices in Plymouth Township. In those days, the township had four justices; the village had none. Perry Richwine recalls that one of the other justices in the 1920s was Bill Webber, who lived on Sheldon Road near the present Ford heater plant.

JPs could hear cases from adjoining townships. That Mrs. Patterson's

record was favorably noted in neighboring townships is evident from the many cases brought to her court from outside the community.

Richwine, who was beginning his practice as an attorney in Plymouth in the late 1920s, remembers that Judge Patterson was popular with everyone except defense lawyers. They claimed that no amount of evidence would sway her once she had made up her mind. Richwine, who tried several cases before her, says she was always good to him.

JUDGE PATTERSON'S reputation as an ardent member of the Women's Christian Temperance Union was well known.

During the prohibition era, state officials brought to her court offenders charged with bootlegging. Inebriated hoboos, picked up at the railroad junction by George Springer, the village's one-man police force, were also hauled before Mrs. Patterson. They received little sympathy. Her usual prac-

tice of giving them 30 days in jail earned her the nickname "Thirty-day Phoebe." On the other hand, two trouble-making boys brought before her were merely sentenced to attend church. Mrs. Patterson's courtroom was the front room of her house, built by her husband in 1882 with the assistance of his father. The house still stands at 207 Ann Arbor Trail, adjacent to the railroad tracks. It remained in the Patterson family for 78 years, being sold in 1960.

The court case, which made Mrs. Patterson well-known throughout the state, had its origin when the judge summoned William Leibnitz, a Detroit baker, to appear before her on Nov. 29, 1919. The charge was non-payment of a note on an automobile he had purchased. She found him guilty, much to the chagrin of his lawyer, James Pound.

JOHN HUBERT

John Bradford Hubert, 94, a former Plymouth resident, died Aug. 13 in Presbyterian Village.

Mr. Hubert organized and was president of the People's State Bank of Plymouth, from which position he became one of the original organizers and first chief examiner of the Detroit

office of the Federal Housing Administration.

Upon his retirement from FHA, he organized and managed the Hubert Insurance Agency, Detroit and Royal Oak.

He resided in Birmingham for more than 30 years before entering Presbyterian Village. He was a 33rd degree Mason and Knight Templar and a member of Birmingham Senior Men's Club.

Survivors include sisters, Mrs. Ana Leland of Seattle and Mrs. Grace Waterman of Jackson; sons, Forrest B. Hubert of Bloomfield Hills and Robert W. Hubert of Arizona; daughter, Mrs. Read Jenkins of Bloomfield Hills; 10 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

ALBERT M. ROHDE

City approves dental package

The City of Plymouth approved a two-year dental insurance policy for its 76 employees at Monday night's city commission meeting.

The dental protection will cover DPW workers, non-union employees, the firefighters union, whose contract was ratified by the commission Monday, and the police officers, whose contract is still unsettled.

THE CITY received a price of \$10,000 per year for its insurance premium for the dental fringe benefit — \$5,000 lower than the closest bidder.

The commission approved the low bid of Great West Assurance Co. for a two-year policy. For routine dental work, the city will pay 60 per cent of the expense and employees the balance. For major work, the cost will be split 50-50. Coverage does not include orthodontic work.

City Manager Fred Yockey said the policy will cover police officers when an agreement is reached with the Teamsters for the police department. Dental insurance has been discussed with police during negotiations, he said, but has not yet been made as a definite offer.

THE COMMISSION unanimously ratified the new contract with the firefighters, despite some reservation over an agency shop clause.

The contract calls for a seven per cent across-the-board wage increase — the same granted to the DPW — plus a \$50 per month food allowance increase for a total of \$275 per year per man.

The agency clause provides that any member of the fire department, except for the chief, who doesn't be-

long to the union must pay \$15 per month union dues. Union membership isn't required. The DPW and police have had agency shop agreements, but this is the first time the clause has been added to the firefighters contract.

Commissioner Harold Guenther questioned the agency shop provision but Yockey said the city had no choice because it would lose if the issue were taken to arbitration, especially because the other two city unions have an agency clause.

"This is a very good contract and one we can live with," said Yockey.

OTHER PROVISIONS of the firefighters contract, carried over from previous agreements, include a residency clause that firefighters must live within a six-mile radius of city hall.

a maximum of \$600 per year; clothing allowance of \$300 per year; plus the dental insurance.

With the new wages, a beginning firefighter will earn \$11,557 per year, \$14,822 for the second year rate and up to \$16,425 for the fourth year. Lieutenants will be paid \$17,810.

The commission also voted to raise the pay of non-union employees to match the increase given the DPW and firefighters. Last July, non-union employees were given a 5 1/2 per cent wage increase which was raised to seven per cent Monday night.

The commission also delayed until its Sept. 15 meeting a request for a Class C license extension. The license is for a family-type restaurant open evenings-only to be operated by R. Terry Cuson at 555 Forest.
