Plymouth wins 46-acre annexation

A 46-acre parcel at Plymouth and Haggerty roads will be shipped off the Plymouth Township tax roles and added to the City of Plymouth next year.

That was the ruling of the State Boundary Commission at an adjudicative session Sept. 3 which allowed the annexation of the Burroughs' parking lot to the city.

The decision was unanimous among the four boundary commissioners involved in the decision, but appeared to surprise both township and city officials.

"I think everyone was a little surprised," noted Plymouth Mayor Be-

verly McAninch. "We're very pleased with the decision and think it was a fair decision."

Township Clerk Helen Richardson said township officials were surprised for other reasons. "We felt the arguments given to the boundary commission were unfair and false in many cases. The commission didn't study the matter completely enough."

When asked to elaborate on the unfairness of the decision, Mrs. Richardson said the township would wait until the written decision of the boundary commission was completed before making further comment.

The shift of the property from the confines of the township to the city will likely take place "sometime be-

fore Jan. 1," according to boundary commission Executive Secretary Jim Hyde.

Hyde said a formal written decision of the commission must be approved before the actual annexation can take place. Annexation of the property would take effect 61 days after the written opinion is approved.

Questions of whether the township will take court action to reverse the boundary commission's decision will have to wait until after the written opinion is handed down and is reviewed by township attorney Donald Morgan, according to Mrs. Richardson.

The total annexation involves nearly

135 acres of land on the eastern edge of the city. About 90 acres of the parcel to be annexed are owned by the Wayne County Road Commission as part of the Middle Rouge Parkway. The remaining 46.14 acres are bounded by Plymouth Road on the south, Haggerty Road on the east, and the C&O railroad tracks at the north.

According to Township Treasurer Joe West, the developable parcel is currently assessed at close to \$300,000 by the township and is zoned for commercial along Plymouth Road. The remainder of the parcel is zoned for mid-rise residential development.

The current total taxes received by the township on the property are approximately \$900 per year.

With the city's tax rate being approximately five times greater than that of the township, the vacant parcel would produce close to \$4,500 in revenue for the city when placed on the rolls next January.

Three petitions were filed by the city to annex the parking lot, the Hillside Inn, and the entire township in May of last year. Within hours after a consolidation election failed by a 2-1 margin.

The boundary commission later rejected the petition on the Hillside Inn property because it was improperly drawn up.

According to a boundary commission employee, no new petition has

been filed for the annexation of the Hillside property.

While city officials feel the Burroughs parking lot annexation will mean little in terms of current revenue, they are eyeing it as a prime location for development in the future.

According to retiring City Commissioner Harold Guenther, having the parking lot located within the city could hasten the development of the parcel. "The township's approach is not one of hunger, like that of the city. The township could wait longer for development to take place on the parcel, but the city has a more immediate need to expand its tax base, and

Festival runs out of 'kuchen'

The sun shone on the opening day of the Plymouth Fall Festival and the Business and Professional Women's German Dinner.

Serving lines on Penniman Avenue were long during the noon hour but in the evening they stretched from Main Street to Union and curved back across Penniman and down the park side.

Sandra Davis, BPW president, said, "We served more than ever before, but just ran out of the kuchen."

They sold 3,000 servings of the apple and cherry kuchen prepared by the German Club.

Almost all of the 6,000 meat servings were sold.

Betty Andrews was in charge of the

dinner project this year. The 70 active members of the club worked throughout the day or in shifts.

Janet Richwine, first vice president, and Charlotte Tate, second vice president acted as "trouble shooters," lending a hand wherever most needed at the time.

"The Lions Club set up the serving line for us," said Mrs. Davis. "I don't

know what we would do without them. They are our big brother organization."

Proceeds of the German dinner help fund the scholarships awarded annually to high school seniors.

"We hope to be able to raise the amount given in scholarships to a total of \$2,000," said Mrs. Davis.

For fired Crestwood teachers

Members of the Plymouth Education Association (PEA) are financially aiding fellow teachers in the Crestwood School District, who have lost their jobs because of participation in last year's strike.

PEA members last week voted 324-234 to hike their regular \$163 annual dues by \$75 as part of a general campaign of the Michigan Education Association (MEA) to raise funds for the dismissed Crestwood teachers.

The money is earmarked for a special MEA financial assistance fund, designed to grant \$8,000 or \$9,000 to each dismissed Crestwood teacher, according to Kenneth Gabel, executive director of several MEA groups in Wayne County, including the Crestwood Education Association (CEA).

"As part of the program of support for the Crestwood teachers and their struggle to regain their positions, other districts are conducting numerous activities, including donation of financial assistance," Gabel said.

The MEA hopes the funds reach an adequate level "to provide a subsistence wage for all the teachers who are out of work," he explained.

"The goal may be \$8,000 to \$9,000—enough for them to subsist on and continue their battle. If necessary, we'll wage this struggle to recover their positions through the year. We expect the fund to involve more than \$1 million."

PEA President Candi Reece hailed her union's vote of financial support as evidence of sympathy for the Crestwood teachers.

"It really made me feel good that my teachers have a feeling for other teachers who have been fired," she said. "They understand the plight of people other than themselves. I felt very gratified. I felt proud to say I was their president."

ONE PEA MEMBER, who refused to disclose his identity, noted the 234 votes cast against the \$75 donation

and cited a rumbling of discontent among the PEA's membership.

"Many of our teachers feel we are

being railroaded into giving our money to the Crestwood teachers," he

Schools must show cause

Agardys go to court

Members of the Plymouth Board of Education were expected to appear at 9:30 this morning before Circuit Court Judge Roman S. Gribbs to show cause why David Agardy "is being forced to attend Plymouth Canton High School."

Maurice Breen, Plymouth attorney, filed a complaint on behalf of his clients, Julius, Jean and David Agardy, last Friday.

After months of deliberation, the school board last week denied a request to permit David Agardy to attend Plymouth Salem High School because in a rezoning of school boundaries announced last fall the Agardy family had been shifted into the Plymouth Canton zone.

The Agardys had shopped for two years for a home before they moved to the area several years ago. One of the prime attractions of the Salem part of the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park was basketball coach Fred Thomann. Eric Agardy, the middle son, thrived under Thomann's coaching and the 6-8 cager played a major role in the Rock team becoming a top contender for the Class A state championship in his senior year.

A DAUGHTER also attends Plymouth Salem. She will be allowed to finish her senior year there. But the change in attendance boundaries

switched the younger son to Plymouth Canton, and the parents requested that the attendance policy be suspended.

Breen pleaded his clients' case at the last two meetings of the school board. Their request was denied by an unanimous board decision at the Sept. 1 meeting.

The complaint filed by Breen said, in part:

"That the complainants moved into the so-called Plymouth Salem attendance school area and that the school board subsequently changed the school attendance area so that complainant David Agardy and parents

now are forced to attend the Plymouth Canton school.

"The complainants seek relief from this honorable court for the reason that other children of the Agardy family attend the Plymouth Salem school and David is being forced to attend the Plymouth Canton school for reasons not properly brought forth at the regular school board meeting."

"WHEREFORE, your plaintiffs seek relief in this cause and pray that a mandatory order be issued forthwith against the school board wherein David Agardy shall be placed in the Plymouth Salem school until such time as a full hearing can be held."

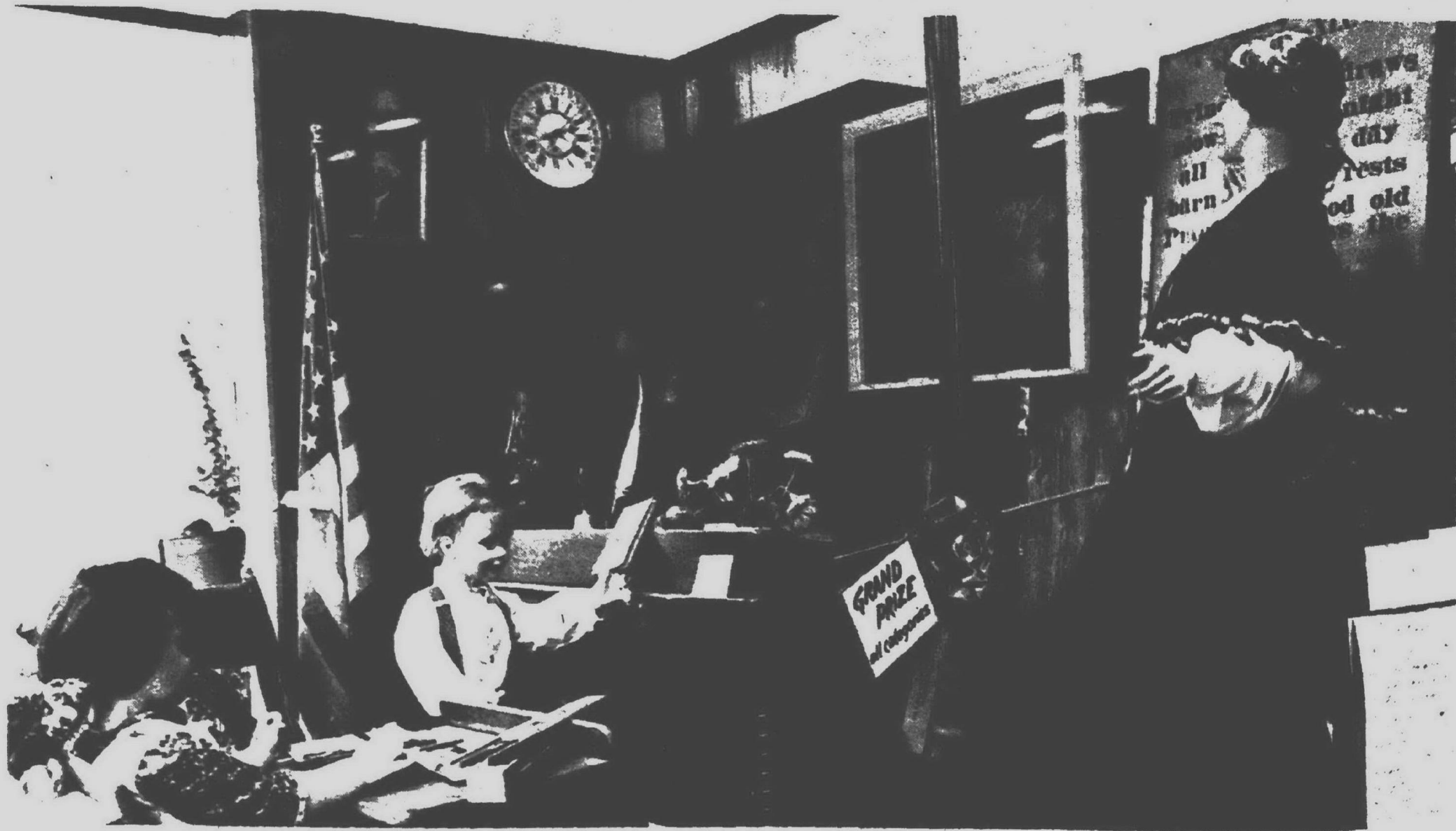

Attorney wants jury to visit murder scene

Circuit Judge Horace Gilmore is considering a defense request that the jury be permitted to visit the alleged scene of the Terry Buchman murder in Canton Township.

Plymouth attorney Robert B. Delaney made the request on behalf of his client, Robert Umney, who is standing trial for first degree murder. Umney is charged with shooting Buchman in the early morning hours of Jan. 28 in a field at the corner of Joy and Ridge roads.

As Umney's trial continues today (Monday), Lloyd Cash, witness for the defense, will return to the stand for cross-examination.

The trial began last Thursday before Circuit Court Judge Horace Gilmore. Prosecutor Richard Whitney made his opening statement. Delaney reserved his opening statement until he begins his defense.

First witnesses for the prosecution were Tom Buchman Sr. and Tom Buchman Jr., father and brother of Terry Buchman. They had identified the body of the deceased. Their testimony was brief and there was no cross examination.

Patrolmen Keith Emerson and Dennis Cooke of the Wyoming State Highway Patrol were called. They have been in Detroit since the trial of Barry Provow, who was charged in the same shooting.

During Provow's trial, Judge Thomas J. Roumell had complimented the pair on their "fair, full testimony" and said they were a credit to "themselves and their state."

They again testified that the car containing Barry Provow, his wife Leslie, and Umney had been stopped because they refused to dim their headlights. They claimed their ownership title had been stolen and they were released with a warning.

The clean Oklahoma license plates and the muddy car caused one patrolman to run a check, and he learned a woman bearing Leslie's description and two men were wanted for murder in Michigan. They apprehended the trio at the Laramie exit of the expressway.

Dr. Sawait Kanluen, under cross-examination, said that Buchman could have been dead from the rifle bullet in his heart before the shotgun blast to his head.

He explained because there were 2,500 cc of blood in the chest cavity, which would be half the blood of a man Buchman's size, there was a strong indication the rifle shot killed him.

He said Buchman's pockets contain-

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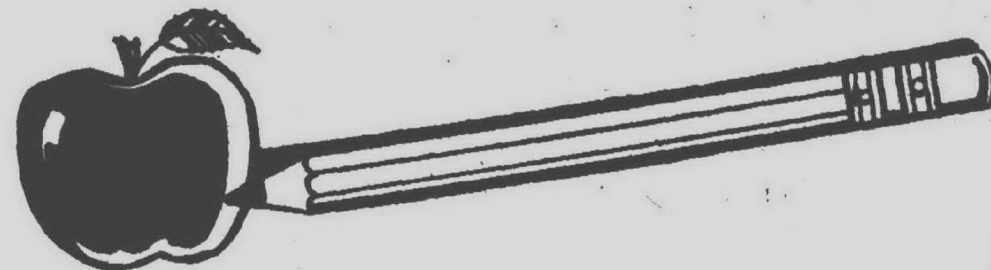

to the German Band and other performers in the band shell.

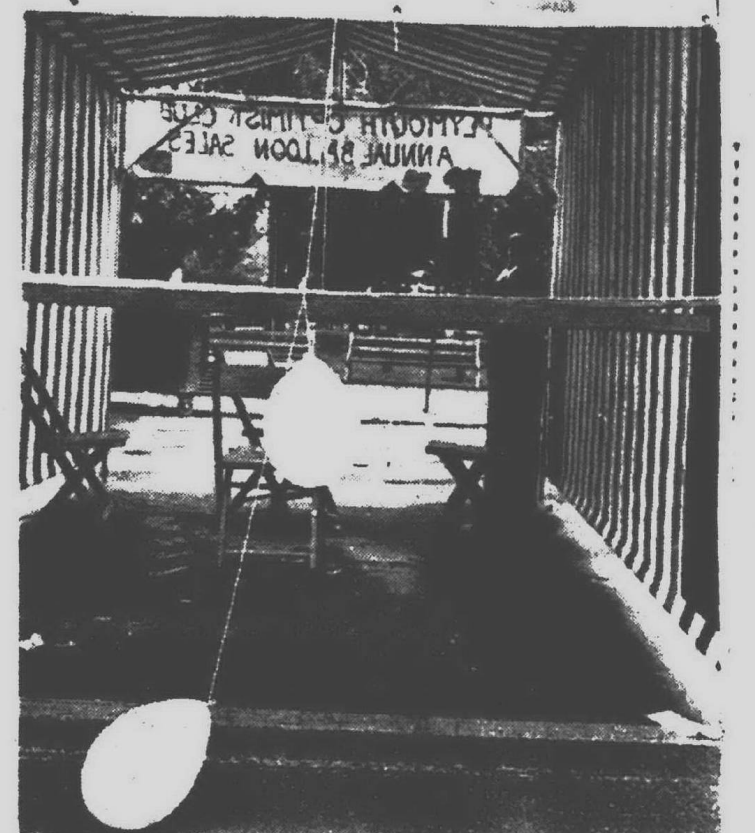
After weeks of rain, the weather was almost too good to be true. But, they say, the sun always shines on the festival....

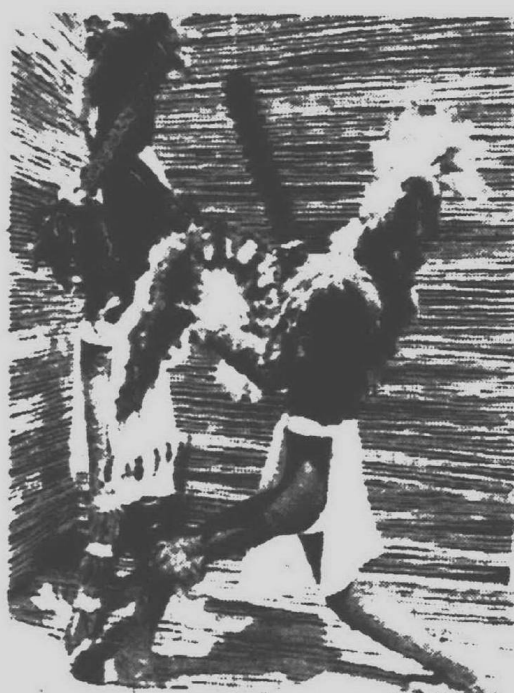

said. "I think the parents of this district should be aware there are some teachers who just want to teach."
"Many of us are sick and tired of this. The Crestwood teachers played the game, and they lost."

But Mrs. Reece said the vast majority of PEA members agreed to abide by the majority decision in a reaffirmation vote, as outlined in the PEA's constitution. All but approximately 35 PEA members participated in last week's election.

All but approximately 30 teachers now working in the Crestwood School District were hired to replace the district's fired teachers, according to a spokesman for the Crestwood School Board.

THE DISTRICT'S school board and administration have so far conducted hearings for 14 of the fired teachers, the spokesman said. The district will conduct hearings, designed to determine individual violations of the Public Employee Relations Act (PERA) which outlines the illegality of teacher strikes. "as expeditiously as possible."

Reinstatement is "in order" for teachers found innocent of PERA violations, he said. The board so far has found seven teachers innocent. Recently hired teachers will not be dismissed if former teachers are rehired.

Crestwood teachers were fired by the school board last December because of alleged participation in an illegal strike. A court order reinstated the fired teachers until July 12, however, and temporarily dismissed other teachers hired as replacements.

That action averted sympathy strikes in Wayne County last January, when Plymouth teachers and other MEA members threatened to walk off their jobs in support of Crestwood teachers.

Mrs. Reece said the PEA has not reopened the question of a sympathy strike in support of the CEA.

"Our executive board has just dealt with the financial assistance question," she said. "That's all we've really talked about."

Gabel, however, did not rule out the possibility of a sympathy strike in Wayne County to support Crestwood's dismissed faculty staff.

"I don't know," Gabel said, when asked about the possibility of walk-outs. "There is a good deal of sympathy for the Crestwood teachers. Whether that sympathy will express itself in

an area strike, I don't know."

MEA members will assist the Crestwood teachers through activities other than financial assistance, Gabel said.

"It may be picketing, but I guess we haven't developed that yet. We have one objective—to get these teachers back to work. We intend to do that."

Gabel said all the MEA groups which have voted on the financial contribution issue so far have agreed to hike their dues by \$75. The MEA is asking all its members in Wayne County to contribute a minimum \$75 and members throughout the state to make some sort of financial contribution.

"I expect most districts in Wayne County will make the contributions," he said. "I expect there'll be Federation teachers (members of the

MEA's rival teacher union) who will want to support this as well."

The MEA will refund money not used for the Crestwood cause to its members at the end of the year, Gabel said. The MEA's representative assembly may contribute funds to bring total Crestwood finances up to the \$1 million mark.

The money will enable Crestwood's teachers to demonstrate for their jobs throughout the year, he said. The MEA may appeal a decision of the Michigan Employment Relations Commission, which found the Crestwood School Board innocent of unfair labor practice charges.

Gabel said Crestwood teachers are now demonstrating in front of the district's schools. They are not carrying signs, but they want their jobs back.

Stratford Festival

Playgoers enjoy drama in relaxed setting

Residents from Plymouth and Livonia were among 12 persons from the metropolitan area who recently visited the 23rd annual Stratford Festival in Stratford, Ontario. The program featured a majority of Shakespearean works and a sampling of contemporary comedies and dramas.

Area residents viewed "Kennedy's Children" by Robert Patrick and Bertolt Brecht's "Trumpets and Drums," a spoof about a captain's efforts to recruit soldiers.

About a 3½-hour drive from Detroit, Stratford offers guests a choice of three stages. The festival's season,

which began last June, continues through Oct. 11.

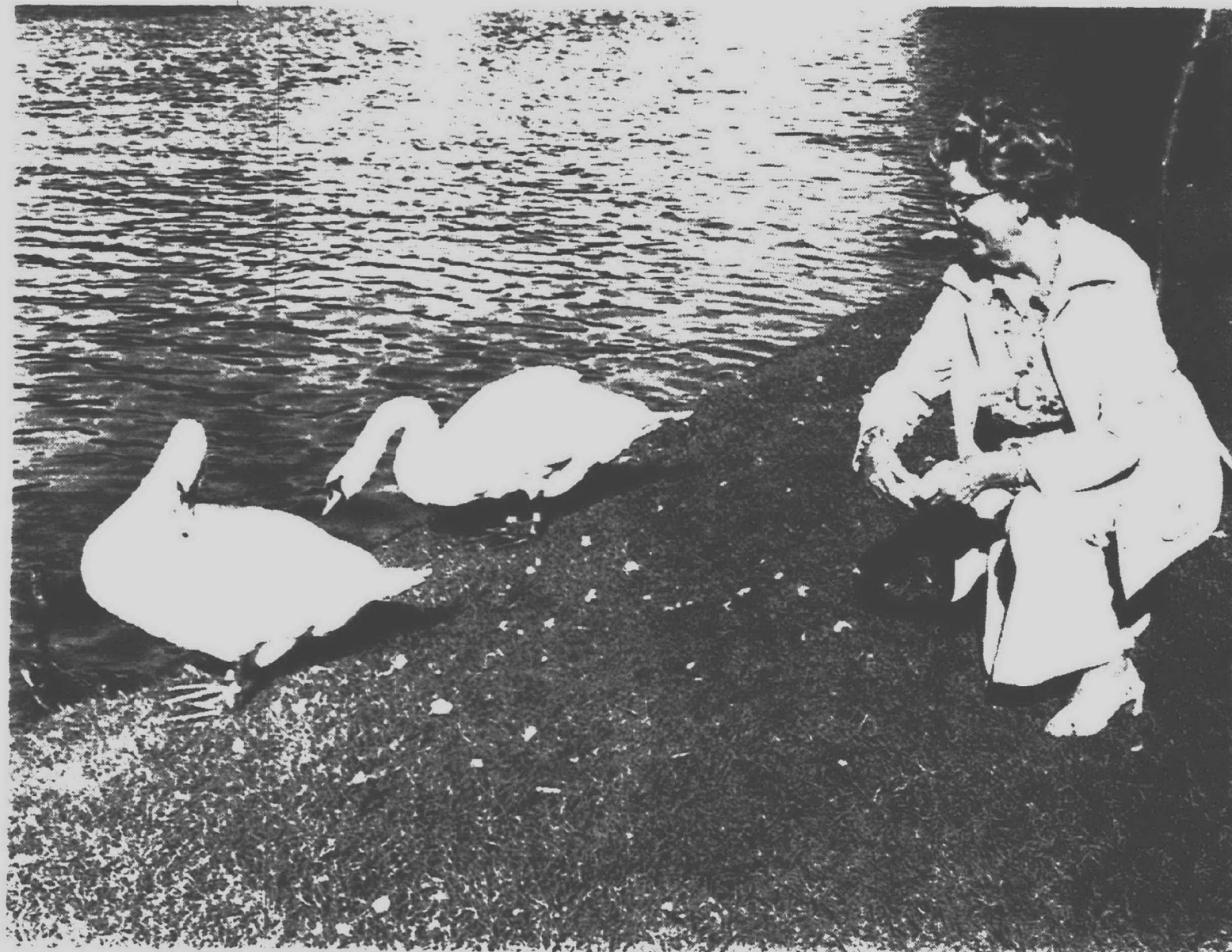
A change of pace is available Sept. 13 to 22 when the Avon Theater at Stratford hosts the 11th International Stratford Film Festival. The festival, begun in 1958 and revived in 1971 after being suspended for several seasons, has premiered such works as "The Harder They Come" and "The Paper Chase." Film festival audiences also have had an early opportunity to see such major films as "Sounder," "Harry and Tonto" and "Amarcord."

Besides live theater and films, Stratford presents Shakespeare seminars,

theater workshops, master classes, concerts and art exhibits, set in the river and treed atmosphere reminiscent of Shakespeare's 16th century England.

After a full day at the theater, area playgoers enjoyed dinner, and a tour of the theater grounds and strolled through the nearby city.

Festivalgoers included Mrs. Mabel Bloxson of Plymouth Township, Mrs. Marcy Tschirhart of Livonia, a librarian in Livonia School District; and Mrs. Dorothy Dluski, of Livonia, formerly a secretary at Churchill High School.

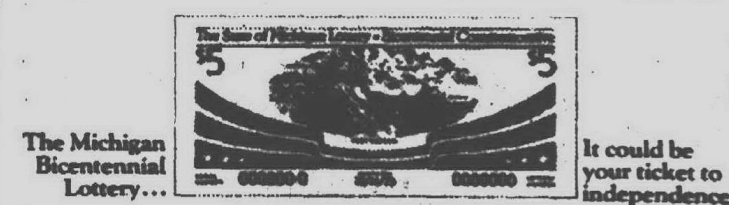

A country boy at the races

There is more than a little semblance of truth to the saying, "You can take a boy out of the country, but you can't take the country out of the boy."

That's why it was like old times the other night when The Stroller joined the throng to watch the harness horse races at the Detroit Race Course—times when he used to sit in the grandstand at the county fair in the Dutch country and watch the rivalries among the farmers who brought their best pacers and trotters out to bid for blue ribbons.

There were some things The Stroller missed the other evening, but in the main, it was another night at the county fair plus the pari-mutuel betting that was unknown in the days of his youth.

AS HE sat there, The Stroller paid little attention to the betting—either by the people racing to and from the windows or the odds that were flashing on the tote board in the infield.

There was nothing like that in the old days, and it was only when the trotters and pacers moved into the metropolitan areas and night racing became popular that the wagering seemed to offset the real purpose of the races—to improve the breed.

WHILE HE WASN'T bothered by the antics of the bettors, he did miss the old style of starting the races. In contrast to today, when the horses are lined up behind a bar attached to an automobile, they had running starts. What fun they were!

Under the rules, no horse could cross the starting line ahead of the pole horse, and they had to come down in line. When they didn't, the starter would ring the bell and the field would have to try again. It was called "scoring."

It was fun to watch the trickery of the drivers. They'd try anything to tire the favorite. Often, they'd purposely race across the line or swing wide until the starter would bellow a threat to fine them.

It was under those conditions that The Stroller got his first exposure to horse racing. And that's why he just sat there the other evening admiring the running of the horses, studying their gaits and marvelling at the manner in which they broke out of the back stretch for the run to the wire.

There is nothing nicer to watch in sport than a good pacer or trotter, especially if you were schooled from youth to watch for such things. The other night he had visions of such great horses of the past—Dan Patch, Sweet Marie, and later Single G—that live in his memory.

WHEN HE LEFT the small home town and came to the city, The Stroller was introduced to the running races—and betting.

He used to sit in the press box at the State Fair Grounds and watch owners and trainers tear up mutual tickets in disgust. Many times he was given a "hot tip." But if the owners and trainers couldn't pick winners,

why should he try to guess the outcome of a race.

As a result, The Stroller, though he covered races for years, never placed a bet—not a nickel—on a horse race. But he had many a laugh at those who did.

One evening, he recalls, Les French, a neighborhood friend, was taking his first look at the trotters. Les was a betting man and couldn't resist the temptation. He had had a bad afternoon betting on the runners so he decided he'd try to get even betting on the sulky riders.

As the horses came down the stretch, the one on which he had bet was out in front. Les jumped with delight. Then, all of a sudden, another horse came out of the middle of the pack and nipped his horse at the wire.

"Imagine that," Les screamed, "This afternoon my jockey couldn't find a hole to get on the inside and tonight I see a fellow drive a wagon (sulky) through one to beat me."

IT WAS A GREAT night at the track with Sen. Carl Pursell's party. While others were racing for the mutual windows, The Stroller sat there silently enjoying every minute watching the trotters and pacers in their well trained manner, battling their way to the finish line.

It was a real treat for the boy who had been lured out of the country. He was now back again in the rural environment of harness racing just as he had been in the days of the county fairs.

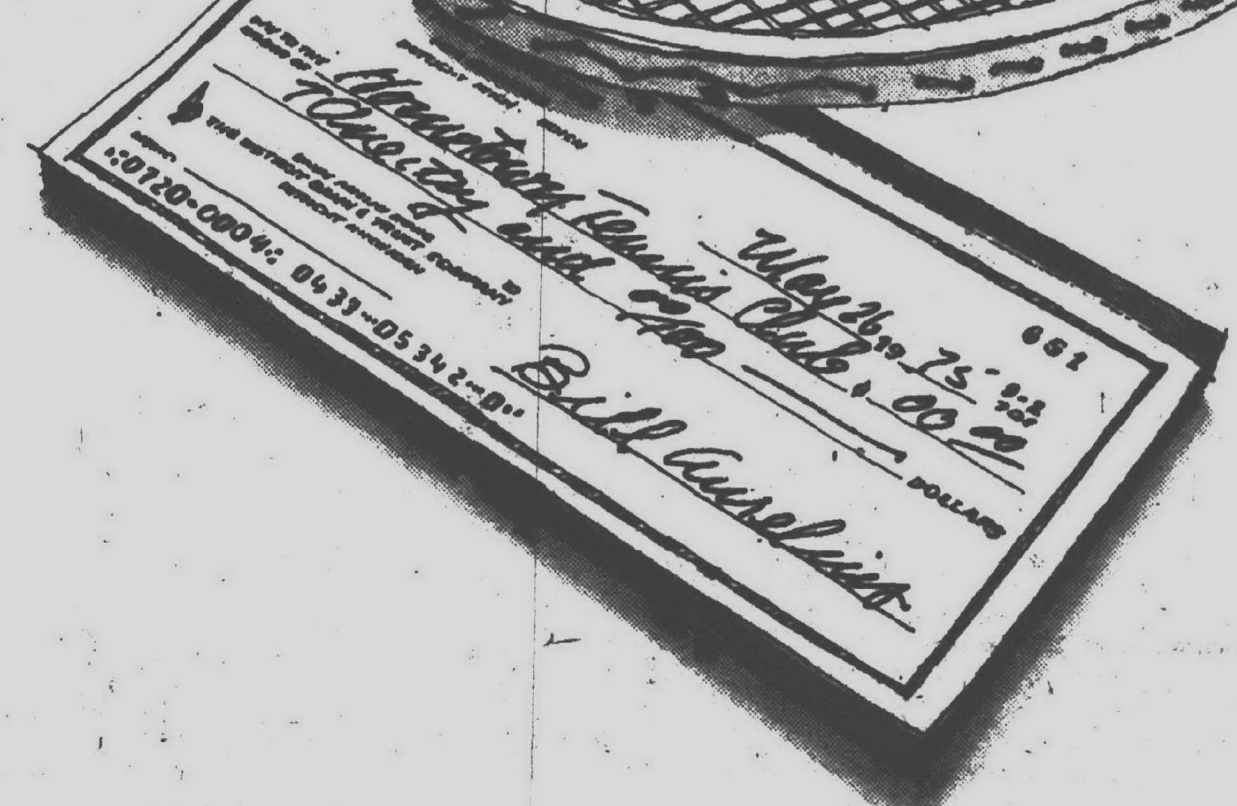
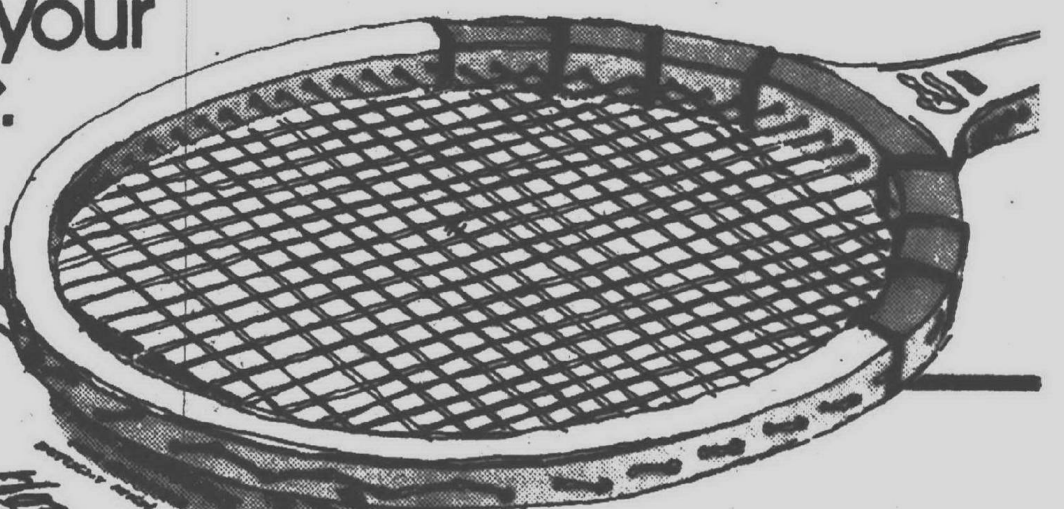
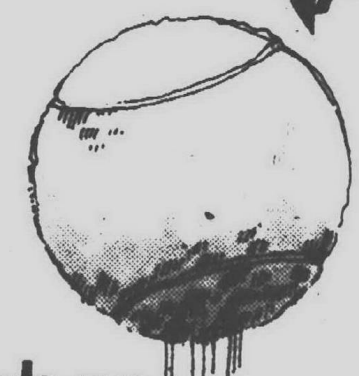

In Plymouth schools

Special ed programs expanded

Plymouth Community School District officials are placing more emphasis than ever on special education programs this year with introduction and expansion of programs designed for students with special needs.

The new programs are keeping Dr. Alice Gretzler, the district's new supervisor of programs and services, busy in her office at Central Middle School.

"There's really a lot happening in special education this year," said Dr. Gretzler, who came to the district in July as an administrative assistant to Dr. Edwin Page, director of pupil services. "We're trying to provide a full psychological service. We feel it can really meet the needs of the kids."

One new program, introduced this year at all grade levels, will attempt to erase specific learning problems that are interfering or blocking a student's educational progress.

"This is a very important position," Dr. Gretzler said of the learning consultants, who will work with regular classroom teachers and students with learning disabilities. "It will give students an opportunity to get special services that couldn't be given in regular classrooms."

"The learning consultant will allow the child to remain in the regular classroom. When special classroom placement isn't needed, the child can still be helped."

Other students with learning disabilities stemming from emotional problems will receive special help this year, according to Dr. Gretzler. Special consultants will help children with emotional problems in regular and special classrooms, established this year at Tanger and Farrand elementary schools and Central Middle School.

Children who needed special place-

ment because of emotional problems were bused to other districts in Wayne County last year.

The district is providing more extensive services for pupils with special needs at the Centennial Educational Park this year. A teacher consultant, a fulltime psychologist, a fulltime social worker and a work study coordinator, who will place special education students in job situations, have been added to the staff.

"Many of these high school kids need practical on-the-job experience," Dr. Gretzler maintains. "They need to get some vocational skills before graduating from high school. This will give them an exposure to careers."

Other programs already introduced or earmarked for establishment in the district this year include:

- A special computerized program, funded by the Wayne County Intermediate School District, to develop individual curricula and objectives for special education students.

Plymouth was one of four school districts in Wayne County selected for the pilot program.

- A "child find" project, under which school officials will establish a system to locate students in the district who need special services.

- Reorganization of special education staff and services into "school cluster" arrangements. At least one psychologist, social worker, speech pathologist, learning disability consultant, emotional impairment consultant and nurse will service each cluster. Each middle school and its feeder elementary schools compose a cluster as does the CEP.

"It provides fuller services and allows these people to know their schools better," Dr. Gretzler said of the cluster arrangement. "It's more of an organized approach."

WEED CONTROL ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONTROLLING AND ERADICATING NOXIOUS WEEDS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF CANTON: TO PROVIDE FOR THE ASSESSMENT OR EXPENSES INCURRED IN CONTROLLING AND ERADICATING SUCH WEEDS; AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF SAID ORDINANCE.

Section I. Noxious Weeds Defined. For the purpose of this Ordinance, "noxious weeds" shall include Canada thistle, doddars, mustards, wild carrot, bindweed, perennial southwistle, hoary alyssum, ragweed, poison ivy, poison sumac, goldenrod, quack-grass, crabgrass, or any other plants which are recognized as inducing hay fever, rose fever, or other diseases, or as being in any way deleterious to the health or comfort of the community.

Section II. The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply only to lots or parcels of land within the Charter Township of Canton which are within or adjacent to residential areas, shopping areas, public facilities or other areas where large numbers of persons can be found or congregate.

Section III. Unlawful to Permit. It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant or any person, firm or corporation in charge of any such lot or parcel of land within the Charter Township of Canton to permit or allow to grow thereon any noxious weeds as herein defined. Presence of such weeds upon any such lot or parcel of land within the Township of Canton is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and inimicable to public health and safety.

Section IV. Duty to Cut. It shall be the duty of every owner occupant or person having charge of any such land within the Township of Canton to cut down or cause to be cut down and destroyed all noxious weeds described in Section I prior to the first day of June, prior to the first day of July, and again prior to the first day of August in each year and as often as may be necessary to prevent same from going to seed.

Section V. Authority to Destroy Noxious Weeds and Collect the Cost of Same. In case any such owner, agent or occupant shall refuse to destroy such noxious weeds or cause the same to be destroyed, it shall be the duty of the Township of Canton to enter upon such lands and to destroy such noxious weeds or cause the same to be destroyed, and such entering upon said lands shall not be deemed as trespassing. Express power to so enter upon such lands and destroy such noxious weeds is hereby conferred upon the Township of Canton. In the event the owner, agent or occupant of any subdivided land in any subdivision in which buildings

have been erected on 50% of the lots included in that subdivision, or the owners, agents or occupants of lots along all improved streets in common usage, for a depth of 55 yards or the depth of the lots, whichever is the lesser, has failed after ten (10) days notice as provided herein, to destroy such weeds or cause the same to be destroyed, then the Township of Canton or any other officer or agent authorized by the Township may enter upon such subdivided lands or lots and destroy by cutting with or without mechanical equipment which will not damage the property or the sidewalk adjacent thereto any such weeds, and all such expenses incurred in such destruction shall be paid by the owner or owners of such subdivided lands. In the event any owner or owners fail to pay such expenses as aforesaid, the Township shall have the right to spread such expenses against the property of such owner or owners on the next County and School tax roll of the next general Township tax roll.

Section VI. Notice. It shall be the duty of the Township of Canton to post notices in not less than three (3) conspicuous places within said Township and to publish a copy of said notice at least once in a newspaper of general circulation within said Township, not less than ten (10) days prior to the time when such weeds must be cut, said notice to be in substantially the following form:

"NOTICE TO CUT NOXIOUS WEEDS"

To the owner or occupant or any person or persons, firm or corporation having charge of any land in the Township of Canton:

Notice is hereby given that all noxious weeds growing on any land in the Charter Township of Canton, Wayne County, Michigan, must be cut and destroyed on or before the day of A.D. 19 . Any person failing to comply with this notice on or before the date mentioned shall be liable to the imposition of the penalties set forth in Ordinance No. of the Charter Township of Canton, Wayne County, Michigan, and shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the Township in destroying said noxious weeds, which expenses, if unpaid by the owner or occupant, shall be spread against the property on the next County and School tax roll or the next general Township tax roll.

In the event any noxious weeds remain uncut or uneradicated upon the expiration of such published notice, the Township of Canton shall notify by certified mail with return receipt requested, the owner, agent or occupant of any lands on which such noxious weeds are found growing. Such notice shall contain methods of treating and eradicating such noxious weeds and a summary of the provisions of this section of the ordinance. Failure of the Township to give such notice shall not, however, constitute a defense to any action to enforce the payment of any penalty provided herein or any debt created hereunder.

Section VII. Prosecution of Violators. It shall be the duty of the Township of Canton to prosecute or to complain to the proper authorities of any person, firm or corporation who may violate any of the terms of this Ordinance.

Section VIII. Penalties. Any person, firm or corporation convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Section IX. Severability. The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Record Cass Lake catch proves fish are there to be had

Cass Lake, right in our own back yard in Oakland County, has produced a new state record kokanee salmon—17 inches, one pound, 12 ounces.

Robert Colvin of Orchard Lake caught it Aug. 27 while trolling along a shoal in 30 feet of water. It beats the 1974 record by two ounces.

Generally, kokanee are fewer and further between this year, but they're nice fish.

COHO "JACK" (immature) salmon are being taken at the Flat Rock dam on the Huron River as the Lake Erie fishery develops. Good catches of crappies are reported below and above the dam.

Belleville Lake in the Huron chain is still producing good catches of bass, walleye and crappie. Boat fishermen are picking up a few muskies. Even shore fishermen are picking up good numbers of crappies (on small minnows), some walleye (night-crawlers or small plugs) and bass (crawlers, Rapala lures).

In Oakland County, bass are hitting on Big, Lakeville, Orion, Pontiac and Stringy lakes.

To the east, walleyes are picking up on Lake St. Clair (Rapalas in weed beds) and the St. Clair River (trolling and drifting south of the Edison plant and north of Marine City (flat fish).

HUNTING SEASON is only a week off. Here are some dates and rules:

Sept. 15—squirrel opener; hours are 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Sept. 19-28—bear season in Zone 2 (northern lower peninsula); appli-

cations are being accepted by the state DNR on a first come, first served basis. To apply, send a self-addressed U.S. post card with your 1975 bear or sportsman's license and signature in ink on the blank side. Put it in an envelope addressed to: Bear Permit, Wildlife Division, Department of Natural Resources, Lansing, 48926. Apply once only.

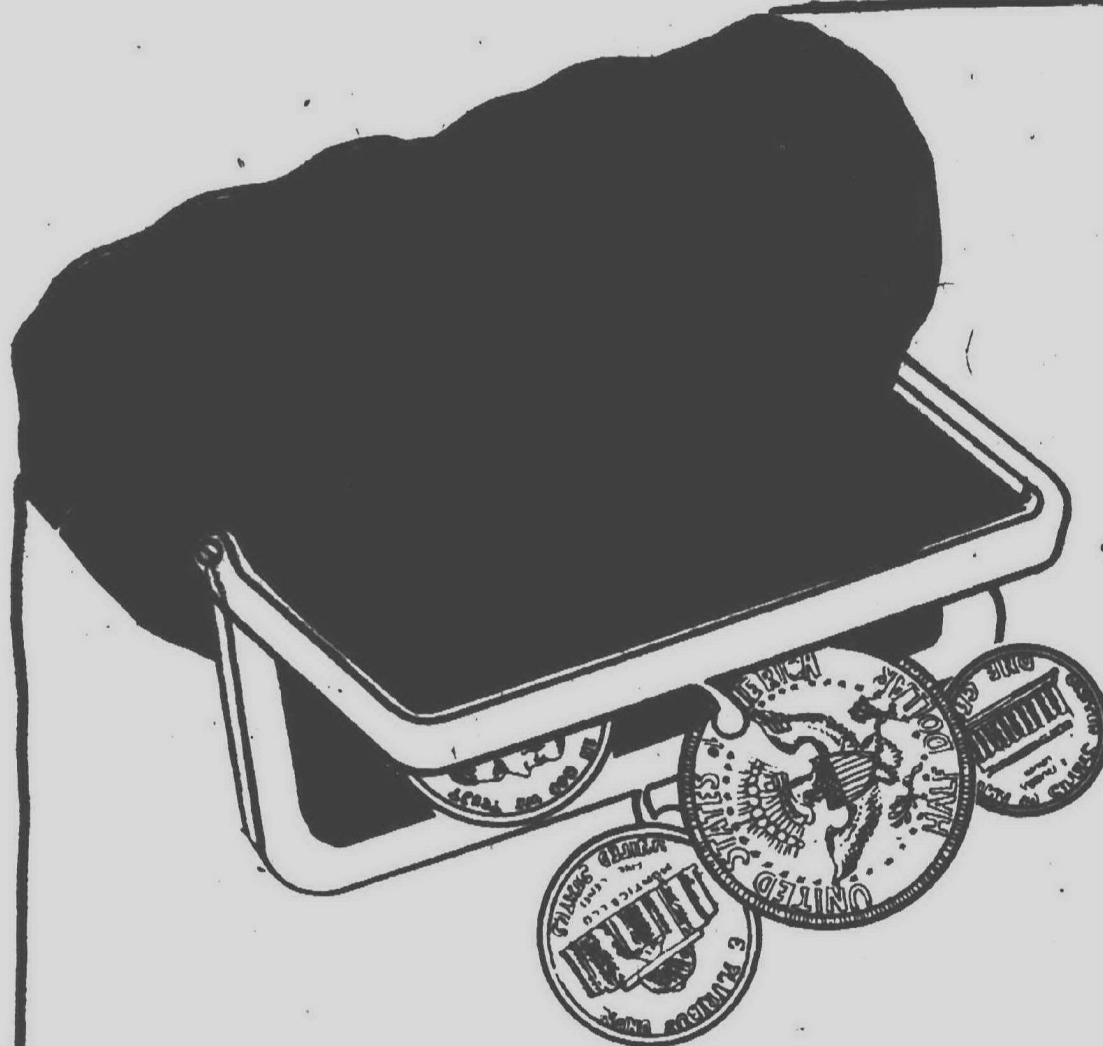
Oct. 8-Nov. 26—duck season statewide.

Oct. 1-Nov. 30—goose season, zones 1 and 2.

Oct. 8-Nov. 30—goose season, zone 3.

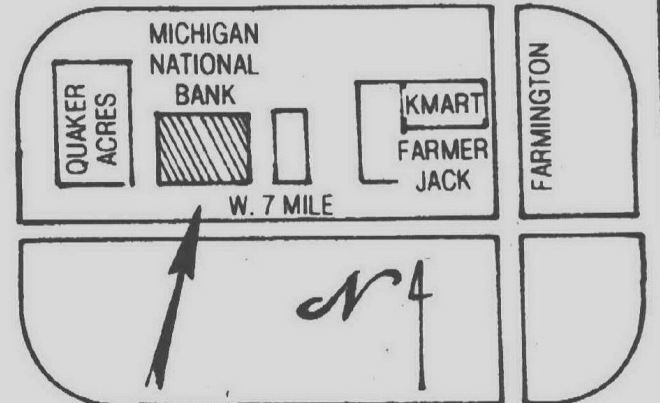

New coach, old habits-- Franklin guns for title

There's something new and something old as Livonia Franklin prepares for another football season.

The something new is head coach Armand Vigna who has been named to replace George Lovich after serving as assistant for 10 years.

The old thing? Franklin looks to be the same powerhouse as always.

"It's a tough thing stepping in as head coach following the outstanding job George (Lovich) did the past seven years here," Vigna said. "But Jerry Cullin (the other assistant) and I have worked with George these seven years and 10 altogether, so things will remain pretty much the same."

Vigna took over the reins when Lovich was named athletic director after running up an impressive 49-3-1 record from 1968 through 1974.

"FRANKLIN HAS WON the Northwest Suburban League football title the last two years and one of our goals is to win it for the third consecutive time," the new head coach explained.

"No one has won it outright three years in a row and we'd like to be the first team to do it."

And judging from the impressive list of returning regulars, the Patriots

should be pretty tough. According to Vigna, the defense especially should be rugged with seven starters returning, including three all-league selections and an honorable mention all-leaguer. The front four in Franklin's 4-3 defense will be ends Tom Rae (6-4, 195) and all-league Bob Suarez (6-4, 205) and tackles Bob Picard (6-2, 210) and 6-foot, 180 pound Al Ancona, the only non-returner.

Tim Hollandsworth (6-2, 205), who will also get a shot at fullback, Sam Williams (6-3, 200) and either senior Chuck Hensch, or juniors Mike Kaseta and Ed McClesky, a transfer from Bishop Borgess, will handle line-backing chores.

In the defensive secondary, which helped post five students, are all-league Jim Casey at safety, honorable mention all-league Jerry Pollard, Larry Urban and either Al Acton or Dave Muller.

"DEFENSE IS definitely our strong point," says Vigna, "and if we can move the ball, we should be all right. The battle for the quarterback slot has been narrowed to three challengers, Dennis Smith, a 6-1, 180 pound junior; junior David Wilson (5-11, 185) who played tailback on the JV team last year and senior Larry Urban, who stands 5-10 and weighs 150 pounds.

Jim Casey, besides his defensive work, will play tailback, and is being pressed by junior Phil Yuhaz, a shifty speed-merchant. Flanker John Sarnes returns but is pressed by junior Tom Thorsby for the job.

Many of the better players, according to Vigna, will go both ways. These include linemen Williams, Suarez, Picard and Scott Mapes, an offensive guard who also may play defensive tackle. Rick Perez (5-7, 175) and Gregg Morgan (6-4, 185) are battling for the other guard spot and Bob Gabel (5-8, 180) and junior John Adam (5-10, 180) both want to be the starting center. Speedster Darrel Gunter, a quick 5-7, 150-pounder will handle split end.

Oak Park has dropped out of the Northwest Suburban League, leaving it with only five members. "I look for Thurston and John Glenn to be the favorites, along with Franklin, but North Farmington, which didn't have a JV team last year, and Garden City East could surprise a lot of people," Vigna added.

Franklin goes into the "meat-grinder" immediately, visiting Fordson. Vigna's alma mater, this Friday. "Fordson is a perennial power and we look forward to playing them. We'll learn in a hurry what kind of team we'll have this year," Vigna said.

Inexperience is East's worry

Coach Gary Humphrey has never had a losing football season in his nine years at Garden City East. During that time he has run up the enviable record of 57 wins, 21 losses and two ties.

And he doesn't intend to start losing now.

But an inexperienced squad and a "back-breaking" schedule will really put the blond mentor to the test this season.

"We are really going to be inexperienced this year," explains Humphrey, whose Panthers went 6-3 last year and 2-3 in the Northwest Suburban League.

His powerful squad suffered three consecutive defeats last year by a total of 22 points and Humphrey feels that a break here or there could have given East a 7-2 or even 8-1 season.

"But that was last year and we have to look at this year," he quickly adds, glancing at East's tough schedule.

The Panthers play their first three games at home against Dearborn Heights Riverside, Bishop Borgess

and Bloomfield Andover. Borgess, Andover and Livonia Franklin, another East opponent, had a combined record of 24-3 last year and should be tough again.

"We don't have a breather on our entire schedule," laments Humphrey, "but I still think we'll do all right. I usually 'cry' a lot at the start of the season. I cried the year we went 9-0 in 1972."

HELPING BRUSH away some of the tears will be a nucleus of five returning starters from East's defensive unit. Chuck Klaska, a 6-foot, 195 pound tackle, will be supported by linebackers Steve Spigarelli (5-10, 180) and Ron Symanski (5-11, 170), halfback Paul Chute (5-9, 165) and junior defensive end Dave McCall, who stands 6-2 and weighs 195.

Joining those five will be one junior, Phil Emery (6-1, 190) at end, and five seniors: noseman Ed McCall (5-8, 160), tackle Jim Wasczenski (6-foot, 190), safety Jim Riley (6-2, 175) and halfbacks Greg Chiti (6-foot, 160) and 5-10, 160-pound Rod McCallister, a transfer from Dearborn Sacred Heart which closed its doors this past June.

Tight end Bob Hudson, a rangy 6-1, 180-pounder is the only returning starter in the Panther offensive line. Wally Krol, who started last year at split end, will try to fill the shoes of departed Britt Ponte at quarterback and holds the key to Panther fortunes this season. Krol, at 5-10, 180, is a talented athlete and should make the adjustment quite well.

Joining Krol in the backfield will be some untested performers in varsity play. Junior Mike Thomas, a speedy 5-10, 160 pounder who once scored five touchdowns in a ninth grade game, has the inside track for tailback. A pair of seniors, Brian Dominick (6-foot, 165) and chunky Keith Siczkowski (5-8, 155) round out the backfield.

COACH HUMPHREY says he's high on sophomore Brian Gibbs, a 6-1, 185-pounder who played tackle last year. "We want to use Brian at fullback because of his size and speed," said the coach, "but we'll have to see how fast he comes along."

Three juniors and three seniors combine with returning Bob Hudson to provide the blocking for Panther backs. The three seniors are end Greg Emery (6-4, 190), who didn't play last year, tackle Dirk Beckwith (5-10, 200) and center Frank Jakubiec at 5-10, 160.

The juniors are guards Mark Roller (5-10, 165) and Keith Keck (6-1, 165) and big Greg McComas, a 6-1, 195 pound tackle.

The lineup is far from settled, according to Humphrey, and there are several other boys who could move into starting positions. Included in

that group is 5-9, 150 pound Dennis Garrett, a senior defensive halfback who has also been impressive this month.

"I believe inexperience is the key word for us but we have a good nucleus to build with. Offensively we're very young, but Wally can throw the ball well and our kids play hard and are very dedicated."

Humphrey also expressed his thoughts about East's tough schedule.

"I believe we play as tough a schedule as just about anybody and there are no breathers on our schedule. We play three schools that lost only two ballgames between them last year."

"In the Northwest Suburban League race, Franklin and North Farmington are always tough and I believe John Glenn will be a lot better than most people think," the veteran coach said.

As an afterthought, he added: "Oh yes, I think we'll surprise a lot of people this year also."

Would you believe that 65 million people across the country bowled at least once during the past year?

That's the figure furnished by the Louis Harris poll just released by the National Bowling Council. The poll shows an increase of 25 per cent in bowlers during the past four years. In 1971 the same poll revealed that 52 million persons took a shot at the headpin.

The poll also showed that more than six million persons bowled at least once a week in regular league play throughout the year.

Among other facts uncovered was that of Americans 18 and older, 41 million (29 per cent) bowled last year. In the group 18 and under, almost 24 million (34 per cent) tried the game during the past year.

Of these, the metropolitan Detroit area furnished at least a quarter million adult bowlers who competed in leagues each week. It is estimated that this number jumped to 400,000 throughout the states.

A patron will receive a coupon for each lottery ticket he presents.

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
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



West led the king of spades. Declarer won the opening lead with the spade ace and began to play clubs. Both defenders had to begin discards at trick three.

It was easy for West to keep his high spade and three diamonds, but East's problem was not as simple and he kept two hearts and two diamonds. Declarer had his three diamonds and a club.

A small diamond was led and the jack finessed. East won with the ace and apparently had not kept track of all the hearts. When an attempt was made to cash the heart ace, West was destroyed.

If he discarded his spade, dummy's jack became a winner. If he discarded a diamond, dummy's six became the magic card.

When declarer holds a long suit the problem can be frustrating to the defense. One cannot follow suit and must begin to discard long before he has any notion of the card distribution.

The hand in the diagram is an illustration. South has three losers. When the dummy is exposed, there appears to be some hope, but the location of the cards and the sequence of play becomes critical.

It is interesting to note the simple play that would have solved all of declarer's problems. He simply needs to play the diamond five.

West will probably carelessly play the three and the six is adequate to force the ace. Of course this is too unlikely to be practical.

THIS ODE to northern Michigan's geological specimens is written because just recently I was able to ignore the rampant weeds outside and long-suffering houseplants inside and spend two weeks not far from that rock beach. I brought home more than my patient family could believe, and the first batches now are tumbling merrily.

Someone asked one of my daughters recently if her mother liked plants. She said she thought I liked rocks better.

She's absolutely right. It's probably sacrilege in this day of ecology and nature and all that, but I have to admit I feel no magic affinity with growing things.

In the first place, my thumb is a livid purple and I have no talent for any kind of gardening, though I do a certain amount out of necessity.

THE TROUBLE IS I find plants of all kinds pretty demanding, and I don't even try to talk to them.

In the house, they have to be watered and put in the right kind of light, and they should be washed and re-

AUTO TIPS

Your car won't start?

By PAT RICK KELLY

The car won't start. It's cranking...there's a long, thick spark...and there's fuel squirting out of the carburetor. It should start—but it doesn't.

So, you crank it some more...and some more. About 99 per cent of all motorists try this method when faced with this kind of problem.

Chances are your problems are only minor ones, and had you approached your no-start problem with the following check-out procedure, you wouldn't have run the battery dead:

WORN SPARK PLUGS. When was the last time you had your car's spark plugs changed? Most people think that the plugs would never get so bad that they would prevent the car from starting. The fact is worn plugs are one of the most common causes of starting trouble.

CLOGGED AIR FILTER. What's that got to do with starting the engine, you ask? Remove the filter and try starting your car. A badly clogged air filter has the same effect as an automatic choke stuck closed.

STUCK AUTOMATIC CHOKE. If it's stuck open, it's difficult to start the car when the engine is cold. If it's stuck closed, the warm or hot engine will have trouble starting. In other words, it should be closed when the engine is cold and open when it's hot. Remove the air filter and check it.

CARBURETOR FLOODING. You can usually smell the gasoline if "it's flooded." That means there's too much fuel if you've had to start the car recently with the throttle wide open. Wait a few minutes before trying again.

WATER IN GASOLINE. How's that possible? Most likely by condensation in the tank. It's a common cool and cold weather problem. Consequently, if there's enough water build-up and it gets in the gas lines, the car won't start.

How can you tell if you have water in your fuel? Collect some of the gas, empty it onto a flat

metal surface, and if it "beads up" there's water in the fuel.

To get rid of the water, have the tank drained and the fuel lines blown out with compressed air.

LOOSE DISTRIBUTOR LOCK. The engine vibration from the cranking can cause the distributor to shift, throwing the ignition out of time enough to prevent starting. The shift resulted from a lock that holds the distributor in place that worked loose. It must be tightened but your ignition must be timed again, also.

VACUUM ADVANCE STUCK OPEN. This condition causes your car's ignition timing to advance so far that the car won't start—hot or cold. Better have it checked.

MECHANICAL ADVANCE STUCK OPEN. The effect is the same as with the vacuum advance stuck open. The difference is the vacuum advance involves the breaker plate of the distributor, while the mechanical advance has to do with the rotor. It's good to have them both checked.

SEVERE AIR INTAKE LEAK. If too much air gets into the engine fuel mixture, you'll have starting problems. This kind of leak is caused by a blown gasket between the manifold and cylinder head or at the carburetor base. Squirt some oil around these locations, crank the engine and if the oil bubbles up and is sucked in, there's an air leak. Inspect the manifold and carburetor. If they're loose, air leaks are possible.

JUMPED TIMING CHAIN. This is a condition that happens when the engine is running or just as it was being shut off. The car won't start the next time. Have your mechanic check the intake and exhaust valves. They should be fully closed on cylinders one or six on six-cylinder engines, and on one or eight on V-8s.

INADEQUATE COMPRESSION. Check with a compression gauge. This condition generally shows up on older cars during the first seasonal cold spell. A blown head gasket will also cause this condition.
