'Bootstraps' bill to be discussed

Plymouth businessmen and officials may find a new state law, designed to add vitality to central business districts, beneficial to Plymouth's downtown area.

The Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce will sponsor an informational meeting Wednesday, Sept. 24, at 8 a.m. in the Plymouth Cultural Center to determine the bill's applicability to downtown Plymouth.

The meeting will feature State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), who will discuss ramifications of the bill, signed by Gov. William Milliken last

Under the new state law, every city, village and township in the state may establish a "downtown development authority."

THE AUTHORITY may levy a maximum two-mill tax within the central business district in cities of fewer than one million persons like Plymouth. Money raised by the authority is earmarked for improvement of public properties within the district and for the authority's operating budg-

The authority will allow "our cities to pull themselves up by their bootstraps," says the bill's sponsor, State Sen. Harry A. DeMaso (R-Battle

"The hub of any town is the downtown area. Too many people have allowed their downtowns to decay. Too often the (local) millage is levied on everybody.

"This bill will allow the businessman to do something for himself, because he has everything to gain."

UNDER THE LAW, nine residents would compose the downtown development authority, including the mayor, city manager or township supervisor. At least five members would "have an interest in property located in the downtown district" and one would reside in the downtown area.

Ramifications of the new law and its implications for Plymouth are the topics of next week's meeting.

Plymouth officials are still unsure of the law's applicability to their city.

"The law is so new," said City Manager Fred Yockey, "and it will take considerable time to study it. On the surface, it appears the law would be helpful for any community that wants to improve its downtown property, but we still have a very vital downtown

"I don't get the impression that

downtown Plymouth is in a state of demise," Yockey continued, "but I think we should look at anything that can make a downtown area vital."

CITY COMMISSIONER Harold Guenther feels the authority could attract new businesses downtown and spur the construction of new stores, if additional parking areas were avail-

"I don't know enough about the details of the bill," said Guenther, "but, assuming it does have a kick, I think there's an adequate number of people who'd like to get involved. I don't think it would get into startling levels of accomplishments without the city's help on parking."

Guenther says additional businesses are needed downtown to expand the city's tax base.

"We need business, very frankly, so we can tax it," he said. "The city, in effect, is a type of business. It hires employes, and it makes purchases. If its tax base isn't expanded at least to the point that inflation is rising, then we have to raise the millage.

"So far, we're able to walk the streets at night in Plymouth," Guenther said. "Part of the reason is because we have a relatively large police force. Everything begins with economics."

Local Cord car awarded national honors

A Cord automobile, on display at the 1936 Chicago World's Fair, is responsible for the hobby of Burton Rich of 6609 Salem Road—a hobby which won him a trophy recently in a national event held in Auburn, Ind.

The proud owner of two 1937 Cords. built by Auburn Automobile Co., Rich has invested several thousand dollars in restoring his two cars.

"I purchased the two cars for \$5,000 but must have invested about \$8,000 in restoring the two-seater." Rich said.

He bought the cars in 1968, a year before retiring from General Motors Diesel Division where he worked in the experimental laboratory for 29 years.

"These cars sold for about \$3,000 each when they were brand new. Today, they sell for as high as \$40,000 each, depending on the model and condition of the car," Rich noted.

The two-place model was but a shell when Rich purchased it. There was no engine or wiring. The four-place Phaeton model was more complete and required less work.

"I belong to the Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg Club which holds a national meeting each year in Auburn, home of the original Cord plant. This year was the 20th anniversary of the club meetings," Rich explained.

HE SAID members either swap parts for the cars or purchase them from two plants-in Tulsa, Okla. and Wellington, Kans.-where parts are still made.

"We sure get socked for parts though, none of them come cheap," Rich said.

The two cars he now has are not the first Cords he has owned.

"I had a sedan first, took it to the national meets since 1964, but then decided I wanted a convertible," he

He did all the mechanical work on the cars, rebuilding the V-8 Lyconing engine little by little as time and money allowed.

The two-place yellow convertible, which won a first place trophy at the recent Cord meeting, has four foreward speeds and front wheel drive.


Rich has won a second and a third place previously with his four-place Cord. This was the first time he entered the two-place model.

"The cars are judged for their running condition, appearance and authenticity. My car took first place in the primary event, a first entry. Next year I may try for the senior event which is the real big prize in the club nationally," Rich explained.

Now that he has the two-place model in perfect working order, Rich is doing some "tuning up" on the maroon four-place Cord.

"I built this garage to house my cars and equipment. The house didn't come with the type of garage I needed," he said.

"I have lived here all my life. In fact, some member of my family has lived in this house since it was purchased back in 1833. It is really an old homestead"-a fitting place for luxury cars of the past to be restored and cared for.







State Police post now under way

The long-awaited second district Michigan State Police headquarters and post is finally under construction.

The \$2.24 million structure, which will house personnel from the Plymouth subpost, the crime laboratory and the Seven Mile Road post in Detroit, is being built on a stateowned 10-acre site on Seven Mile Road in Northville, adjacent to Northville State Hospital.

Although ground-breaking ceremonies were held nearly a year ago on Oct. 14, 1974, it wasn't until recently that actual construction got under

Blocks have been laid for the basement of the one-floor building which will have an area of 40,300 square

LT. EUGENE R. Weiler, who heads the crime laboratory, said the new structure will give laboratory personnel more than twice the floor space they now have in the former Plymouth schools administration building on Mill Street.

"Our six chemists are now occupying 6,000 square feet. The new building will give us approximately 13,000 square feet in which to work," Weiler said.

The lieutenant added that the building will afford the crime lab a firearms room, library, conference room and two dark rooms for photographic

"We will have a polygraph area and a vehicle examination garage in which we can examine vehicles suspected of being involved in a crime,"

The Plymouth crime laboratory serves all police agencies and is available to some 80 different police jurisdictions in Wayne, Washtenaw, and

Monroe counties as well as part of Oakland County.

LT. WILLIAM Tomczyk, post com-

mander, said the detective bureau and all the troopers will be headquartered in the Northville building. This move, which is expected to

take place some time late next year, will not affect police coverage of Canton and Plymouth township areas. "It will not change the areas now patroled by our troopers. They will receive the same protection we are currently giving them," Tomczyk said.

The State Police moved into the Mill Street building in 1972.

Leasing the school building will cost the state more in rent beginning Oct.

The new lease, which runs to July next year, calls for an increase in annual payments from \$19,368 to \$29,988. A State Police spokesman said that when the building is vacated, the state will turn over to the school district the gas pump, tank and radio tower on the premises.

THE NORTHVILLE headquarters building had been under consideration for a long time.

The crime laboratoy alone, grew from five employes five years ago to the present 25-member complement.

The lab, which at one time was located in the old Detroit Edison building on Plymouth's Main Street, has continued to grow.

Lt. Weiler said the workload has increased steadily and "even though our staff has grown, it is almost impossible to keep up with the work."

"The new structure, which is expected to be completed in August or September of 1976, will afford greater efficiency for the State Police units to be housed there," Lt. Tomczyk said.

Madonna gets law grant

WASHINGTON-Madonna College will receive \$120,196 to continue the school's law enforcement education program for the next school year.

The announcement was made by U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor), whose district includes Plymouth and most of Livonia.

The funds are awarded by the Law Enforcemnt Assistance Administration to make grants and loans to law enforcement students attending universities and colleges.

Esch, who says he worked closely with college and federal officials to continue the Madonna program, said Madonna's law enforcement is one of the largest in the state.

Those attending the meeting were Ms. Benson, board of education president; Robert Greenstein, Canton Township supervisor; Norbert Battermann, City of Plymouth commissioner; Richard Gornick, Plymouth Township trustee; Harvey Barkley, Salem Township trustee; and Innes.

The committee reviewed its accomplishments and objectives over the

past year and discussed goals for

THE SUGGESTION that a pilot program be set up in Canton Township in which the school district would act as tax collector was made by Green-

He said the school district could charge a one per cent collection fee and pay the local governments and the county their shares.

Ms. Benson said a report on how the Rochester schools handle this will be available at the next meeting.

A drive to encourage ordinances making the use of non-returnable bottles illegal in the municipalities represented was set in motion. Means of enforcing the ordinance in areas without local police departments was dis-

"What better way to celebrate our bicentennial than to clean up our garbage?" asked the Canton Township su-

MEMBERS WERE asked to report at the next meeting on progress in the area of recreation facilities with the suggestion from Battermann that they "crank up the recreation" joint effort.

In spite of the different powers of planning commissions in city and townships, more cooperation between the commissions themselves and the school board was rated as a priority goal of the intergovermental body.

Greenstein said it was the committee's job to "convince them there is real value in cooperation."

"The mainstay of cooperation is knowing each other," said Batter-

Members of the group agreed to bring administrators, planners and elected officials of the communities together for a dinner meeting. Organization of the get-together will begin at the Oct. 1 meeting of the committee.

THE SAVINGS of group purchasing had been an advantage discussed last year. Plymouth and Canton townships have cooperated in this and Innes reported Superior Township now has a purchasing agent and expects to participate in the plan.

A unified position on drains, public safety, recreation, and waste disposal were agreed upon.

Greenstein said the Penar proposal should be a priority item among the committee's goals. The proposal was a suggestion made by former school trustee Fred Penar that school board surveys used to make projections of student count throughout the area be shared with governmental units.

Uniform police protection of schools was suggested to cut-down on vandalism costs. Ms. Benson suggested cooperation on senior citizen services with an expansion of the school lunch programs, income tax aid and perhaps a blood bank for the elderly within the school district.

Youth Symphony challenged



Vallier blasts SEMCOG:

'Hiding your heads in the sand'

By TIM RICHARD

Leaders of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) are still shy about expanding the seven-county voluntary agency's powers, but they no longer recoil in horror at the idea of taking on new responsibilities.

SEMCOG's Executive Committee last week declared "philosophically unacceptable" the so-called Ryan Bill to revamp it. At the same time, it declared its willingness to work with the sponsor, former State House Speaker William Ryan (D-Detroit), to find "changes that will make our work more effective."

And in its debate, the executive committee listened without anger to a bawling out from member Arch Vallier, a Schoolcraft College trustee from Plymouth, who declared they were "hiding your heads in the sand" on the issue of regional government.

Last Wednesday's debate was in marked contrast to the reaction of SEMCOG leaders to a similar proposal made two years ago. At that time, they had registered immediate and horrified shock at the reform

ideas contained in the Rvan bill. THE RYAN BILL embodies the ideas put forth in "The Regionalist Papers" of the Metropolitan Fund, a research and education foundation.

Since its birth in 1969, SEMCOG has been a voluntary planning agency, wary of attacks that it was a metropolitan government conspiracy, on the one hand, and too weak on the other.

The Ryan Bill proposes: 1. That membership of the 400-plus governments in southeast Michigan be mandatory. SEMCOG's reply is that the voluntary approach is indeed working (transportation plan, housing plan, criminal justice plan, recreation and open space plan, sewer and water plan).

2. That SEMCOG be governed by a 41-member board, of whom 21 (including a chairman) would be elected by the people. At present, SEMCOG's executive committee consists of delegates picked by member governing bodies. SEMCOG's statement, "Local elected officials within SEMCOG have proven that they can tackle the tough regional issues they face.

3. That a charter be written whereby SEMCOG could become an "umbrella" agency coordinating such single-purpose agencies as the metropolitan water board and the Huron-Clinton parks board. SEMCOG officials actually liked this idea.

AFTER LARRY Mainland, SEM-COG's first chairman, stoutly defended the voluntary nature of the organization, Vallier took the floor.

"I've been an elected official on a local basis as long as anyone in this room," began Vallier, a Plymouth city commissioner and Wayne County supervisor before being elected to the Schoolcraft College board. 



Women trustees picked wrong time to bargain

Bargaining sessions with employes in the Plymouth Community Schools could take on a whole new atmosphere next year as a result of some "consciousness raising" on the part of board president Marda Benson and vice president Marcia Borowski.

After reaching a settlement with members of the district's food service employes on a one-year pact, district personnel director Norm Kee came to the board with the agreement already ratified by the employes on Sept. 8.

Working under the premise that we assume most negotiators operate. Kee offered the cafeteria workers a contract allowing an average seven per cent wage increase during the 1975-76 school year, and they accepted it.

With board members George Lawton and Gary Mirto absent from the proceedings, the board voted 5-2 to ratify the agreement. It was not renough to approve the measure, and the road block thrown in by members Benson and Borowski will place the issue before the board at its next meeting on Sept. 22.

THE MOTIVES for blocking ratification are honlest enough—the two women members of the board wanted to make a point and show the district that female cafeteria help are the lowest paid employes in the district.

But the timing of the "consciousness raising" leaves a bit to be desired.

We agree that those who are paid no more than \$2 per hour are most affected by the acute rise in the cost of living, and that they are least able to afford to take less than other school employes who have managed increases of eight per cent per year.

We also agree it's likely that wages are lower in those cafeteria positions because all jobs are held by women. But the time to raise the issue is not after negotiations are completed. The time to speak is before the contract is bargained and approved—during the negotiation process.

Kee was given the responsibility to bargain on behalf of the school district, and we assume he tried to spend as little of the taxpayers' dollar as possible.

WITHOUT further specific input from the board, Kee was well within his realm by making an offer which was acceptable to the employes.

Employes were represented by their appointed negotiators, and those negotiators had every opportunity to make greater demands than those which were included in the final agreement.

If Mmes. Borowski and Benson feel the cafeteria workers have received an unfair settlement, then perhaps their wrath should fall on the employe negotiators and not on the district's administration.

Perhaps they might do some "consciousness raising" with the members of the bargaining unit and not with the administration.

The administration's role in this process is not one of offering more than the employes demand; that just isn't the nature of the collective bargaining process.

THIS APPARENT lack of faith in the administration's bargaining may well make progress more difficult for Kee in future negotiations with other bargaining units next year. Especially when those employe groups are aware that certain board members are willing to offer them more.

We recognize the intent of speaking out for women's rights and applaud that valiant attempt. But we fear the overall effort only served to discredit negotiations which were carried out in good faith by both sides.







That play was set up by a poor Fordson punt and Casey's 16-yard dash on the previous play.


Wilson hit Williams over the middle at the nine and the burly end shrugged off two defenders before going in standing up.

But Forsyth, running with the authority of a 200-pounder, slanted off right tackle and jaunted 22 yards before being tripped up by the last Rock defender.



There were rows of purple, blue and white statice, cerlosia, blue salvia, strawflowers, and globe amarenth in shades of white, pink, purple and or-

During the growing season, the club members took turns caring for the garden. Each week three ladies went out to pull weeds and cultivate. According to horticulture co-chairmen Vivian Bradburn and Elaine Pierce, it was a great season for weeds.

As the flowers bloomed, they were picked and tied for hangingand

drying. At times the extreme heat or rain slowed the growth, but they did harvest as many as five bushels at one picking.

Some flowers were stripped of their leaves. The stems were removed from the strawflowers immediately after picking and a florists wire stem inserted through the head of the flower, bent, then pulled back.







I note that a recent bit of research indicated that "man-eating sharks" are in the main just that. Or, in other words, jaws prefer gentlemen.

Since I don't intend to join the current hysteria over ocean swimming, my interest in this information is more semantic than scientific and has to do more with feminism than with fish or fear.

It leads me, you see, to ponder once again the relationship between the English language and the women's movement and the times when they come into conflict.

THE LANGUAGE, we know, is deficient in that it lacks the assortment of terms meaning either "him" or "her" or both sexes. So it has been the time-honored linguistic solution to this problem to use the masculine when we mean both or either.

This practice now is getting a lot of flack from the women's movement, so we have cropping up a lot of new terms like committeeperson and chair-one.

I REALLY have no quarrel with the terms, although they get a little confusing and unpronounceable, and I understand the feelings that bring them into being.

But I think sometimes insisting upon their use is missing the point of the whole issue


What the woman's movement really wants to do is change the stereotypes of thinking rather than language.

I really don't care whether I'm a newsman or newswoman or newsperson so long as my employer accepts me on an equal basis with my male colleagues in terms of respect, responsibility and salary.

And I find it far more important to have a capable woman as head of a committee than to worry about whether she's called a chairman or a chair-

Language changes probably will come, but the substance of women's liberation is more important than its semantics.
