Umney found innocent in slaying but may face federal gun charge

The first degree murder trial of Robert Umney in the shooting death of Terry Buchman ended Friday when the jury reached a verdict of innocent.

Dr. Dale A. Davis, professor of economics at Eastern Michigan University was foreman of the 12-man jury. After five hours of deliberation he presented the verdict before Wayne Circuit Court Judge Blair Moody Jr. in the absence of Judge Horace Gilmore who had been hearing the case.

ATTORNEYS Richard Zarkin and Robert B. Delaney of Plymouth had defended Umney. He was the third member of the trio charged in the Jan. 28 shooting of Buchman.

Barry Provow, who asked for a non-jury trial, was to receive his verdict this morning (Monday) at 9:30. Judge George Roumell placed his decision in a sealed envelope awaiting the outcome of the Umney trial. Provow's wife, Leslie, pleaded no contest to a

manslaughter charge. She was sentenced Sept. 17 to seven to 15 years.

Det. Larry Patterson of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, officer in charge of the investigation said, "We are flabbergasted at the jury's verdict."

A SHERIFF'S Department spokesman announced later in the day that they had turned the Umney case over to the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Unit of the U.S. Treasury Department. They will ask for a grand jury indictment for a federal firearms violation.

The spokesman said, "We have put a hold on him as a convicted felon in possession of firearms."

WITNESSES in the Provow and Umney trials unfolded a sordid story of drugs, beer drinking, fear, anger and stolen guns that led to the death

of one of their friends. It also resulted in months of tragedy for the families involved. No one knows exactly when it started and it hasn't ended.

Tuesday, Jan. 28—After an evening of drinking and taking "acid," five young persons end up at the corner of Joy and Ridge Roads in Canton Town-

ship. Terry Buchman, 22, is dead. Lloyd Cash, 20, is beaten.

Friday, Jan. 31—Barry Provow, 26, his wife Leslie, 18, and Robert Umney, 23, are picked up by state troopers near Laramie, Wyo.

Friday, Feb. 7—The trio is brought back from Wyoming.

Saturday, Feb. 8—They are arraigned before District Judge Francis E. Burger in Westland, in a makeshift courtroom at the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office on Henry Ruff Road. They are charged with first degree murder.

Friday, Feb. 21—They appear be-

fore District Judge Dunbar Davis in Plymouth for a preliminary examination. All three are bound over for trial.

Wednesday, Aug. 13—Barry Provow's non-jury trial begins before Cir-

Plant security guard is charged with murder of Howmet foreman

A 54-year-old Farmington man faces pretrial examination Sept. 29 in Plymouth District Court, charged with murder in the first degree with malice, in the shooting last Thursday of his boss at Howmet Corp., 41605 Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth Township.

Charles W. Smith, of 23101 Haynes, Farmington, stood mute when arraigned on the charge Friday before 29th District Judge John Seiler.

SMITH IS charged with shooting Walter A. Warbrouck, 44, of Brighton following an argument in the Howmet plant Thursday afternoon.

Det. Ray Allen of the Wayne County Sheriff department said Smith had been hired by Bonded Security Service Inc. and was assigned to the Howmet plant.

The detective gave this account of the murder:

"Smith had been off ill for two days. He called his employer Thursday morning and learned he was no longer assigned to Howmet."

"Witnesses said Smith had been drinking before coming to the plant to talk with Warbrouck about his job," the detective said.

Smith parked his car in the parking lot outside the plant and walked into the building. He was met by two supervisors and asked them where Warbrouck was, reportedly saying, "Where's Walley? The SOB, he cost me my job."

The supervisors told Smith to leave. He refused and began checking areas in the plant.

"He apparently saw Warbrouck enter a men's room and followed him in along with the supervisors. Smith argued with Warbrouck, charging him with being responsible for losing his job at the plant," Allen added.

WITNESSES SAID Smith left the washroom following Warbrouck and the two supervisors into the hall. Just outside one of the offices, Smith reportedly pulled a gun, a .357 Magnum, six shot.

Ron Rohraft, one of the supervisors, grabbed Smith's arm, shoving it upward. The gun went off, hitting the ceiling.

Rohraft ran for help. "Smith is reported to have then pointed the gun at Warbrouck saying, 'And here is another for you,' and fired."

Witnesses told Sheriff deputies that Warbrouck shouted, "I've been shot in the lung." He then fell to the floor.

SMITH FLED out of the plant to his car where he was found when the Sheriff deputies arrived.

"The body was found lying on the floor of the plant, face down," the detective said. "Our men and members of the Plymouth Township Fire Department tried to find signs of life, but there were none," he added.

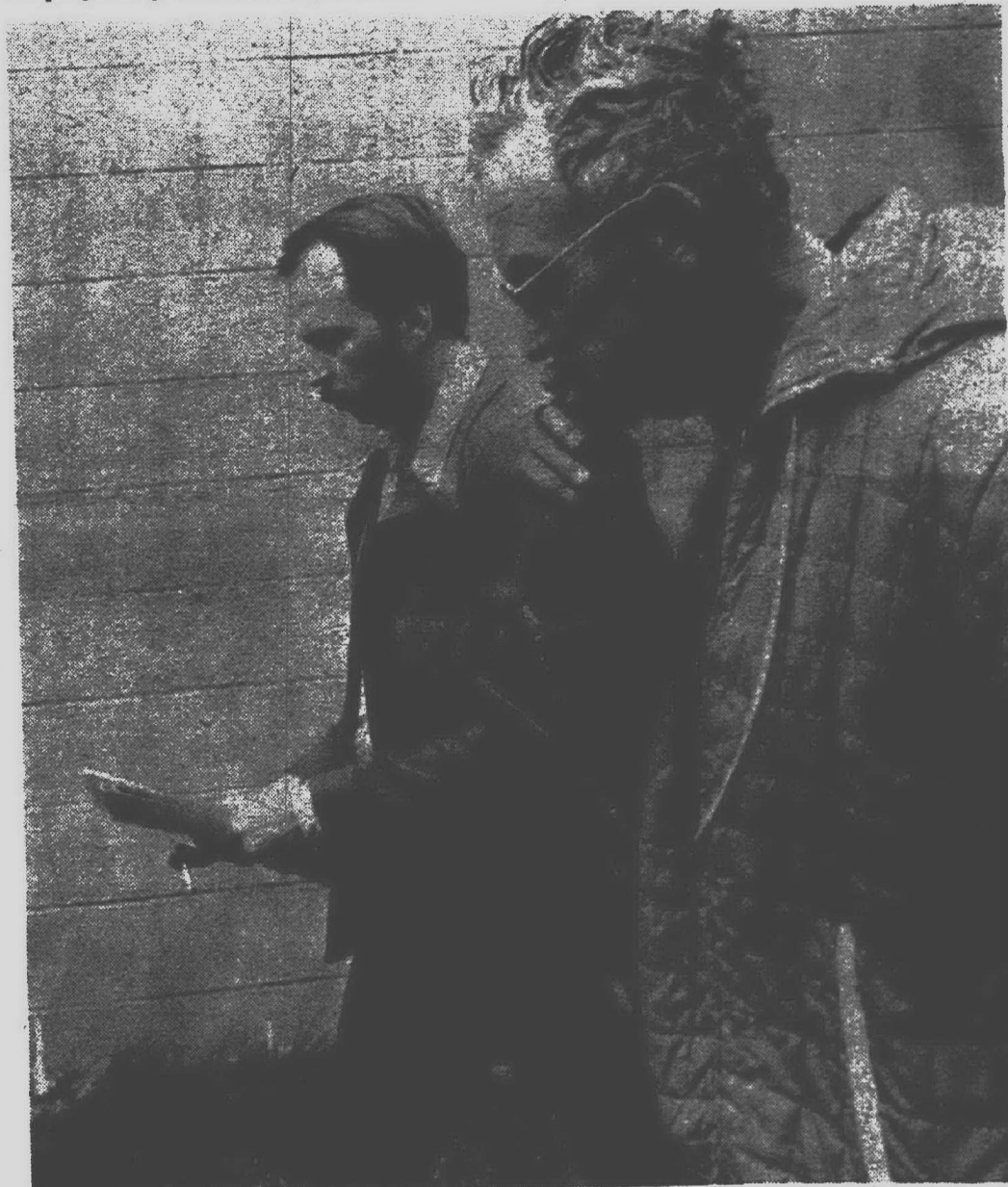
"The gun was found on a nearby desk, having been put there by an employee after the shooting. There were

two spent shells in the six-cartridge Magnum," Allen said.

Smith, who was remanded to Wayne County Jail to await pretrial examination, told Judge Seiler he had been employed by the security service firm

for "about 2½ years." He has lived in Farmington 10 years, has a wife, two daughters and a son.

Smith requested a court-appointed attorney. The judge granted his request.

Dehoco inmates are moved to Salem for welding class

School Supt. John M. Hoben said Friday that because of a change of scheduling, Detroit House of Correction inmates would attend night welding classes in Plymouth Salem High School.

Regular adult education welding classes will be held in Central Middle School. Until Dehoco officials agreed to the change in time, welding classes for the inmates had been scheduled to begin today (Monday) in Central.

ABOUT 40 PARENTS and teachers were in the audience of the Central Middle School PTSO board meeting last Thursday evening. They came loaded with questions.

The rumor that Dehoco inmates were beginning welding classes in a building housing elementary classrooms at Central had reached a few ears on Wednesday.

Telephones rang all day Thursday as the news spread that the rumor was true. The Dehoco inmates had attended welding classes in Plymouth Salem for two years as part of the continuing education program. More space was needed. The welding shop at Central, used as storage space for supplies since the high school moved to the Centennial Educational Park, was being reactivated.

Jim Mortensen, PTSO president, invited Larry Masteller, director of continuing education and recreation for the Plymouth Community School District to explain the move. Donald Gregory, senior community services assistant at Dehoco, fielded questions concerning members of the welding class.

Main concerns of the parents and teachers were security, noise and

type of prisoners attending the classes.

MASTELLER said the welding shop would be closed off completely from the rest of the school. The bus would drive up to within a few feet of an outdoor entrance where the inmates would disembark.

He explained that washroom facilities would be available in the area set aside for the class. At Plymouth Salem, the Dehoco students are allowed one break when they are escorted to a washroom several rooms away from the welding shop.

Masteller said the district receives

state aid for the students on the basis of ¼ per inmate. He estimated that, for the 100 persons involved in the welding classes, the schools would receive state aid for 25 fulltime students which would amount to about \$30,000.

Dale Rothenberg asked, "What is the nature of these people? What security measures are taken?"

"These are trustees," said Gregory. "They are 17 years of age or older. They have been convicted of some crime—maybe even 90 days for letting his dog run loose. We depend on them to cook and clean. They do laundry for hospitals, work on our farm, do the canning."

Schools seek American Indians

Elementary principals in the Plymouth Community School District will conduct a survey this week to identify the children of American Indian descent.

The survey's purpose is to determine if the district is eligible to receive federal funds for the improvement of education of children who are part American Indian.

The funds are available under Title IV, Part A, of the Indian Education Act and may be used for activities such as arts and crafts, and supportive activities such as counseling and job placement. Funds also may be spent for health and dental needs.

Rules governing the financial grant require the parents of Indian children be involved in the planning for the use of funds and in supervising and evaluating the program.

A child who has one great-great-grandparent who was a full-blooded Indian is counted as an Indian, as defined by the Office of Education in Washington, DC.

The information is to be gathered by having each child take home a form to be completed by families who think they might be eligible. Anyone feeling they might have an eligible child should contact the board of education offices on Harvey Street in Plymouth and a form will be mailed.

"They work in the commissary, do the typing. They could escape from Dehoco at any time."

"About 10 out of every 20 want to improve themselves, and it is from among these that we decide who will enroll in the welding class."

"I understand your fears," he continued. "No one with a sexual record would be admitted to the class."

"AT SALEM the biggest problem was the students who wanted to see our people."

"The inmates were jealous of the narcotics students were getting that they weren't allowed to have."

Sue Harper, whose third grade classroom abuts the welding shop, was concerned about noise. "The rooms are not soundproof, and I don't think an elementary school is the place for prisoners."

Mortensen asked how many security guards there were per inmate. He was told a bus driver and the instructor.

Second grade teacher Barbara Overholt suggested they change the scheduling and hold the class at night.

Instructor Patrick Murray who has taught the class at Salem for two years said he felt they were "emotionally over-reacting." He said it was a case of "rehabilitate them in your back yard, not mine."

Before the group left on a tour of the welding shop and adjoining classrooms, Mortensen asked School Board President Marda Benson to give them her feelings on the problem.

Ms. Benson said she sympathized with their concerns and would initiate immediate discussions to arrange alternate scheduling.

Board may hire 2 new principals

The Plymouth Board of Education is scheduled to approve the hiring of principals for two new elementary schools at tonight's (Monday) meeting.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High, 8415 Canton Center Road.

TWO OF the district's three new elementary schools are scheduled to open in January, 1976, and the administration is anxious to have the board approve principals for both, so they can get involved in preliminary work toward opening the schools.

The principal appointments are for the Truesdell site school and for the Windsor Park site school.

The board will also be asked to approve a water easement worked out between the school district and Canton Township for Phase III construction at Plymouth Canton High.

UNDER OLD BUSINESS, the board will be asked again to approve a master contract for cafeteria employees.

It failed to receive approval at the last meeting when two school board members objected that the hourly rate at the lower end of the pay scale was insufficient.

Another easement agreement up for approval will be between the school district, Gould Development Company and Ford Leasing Development Co. at school site number four.

Man regains chopped-off thumb

A Plymouth resident who lost his thumb in an industrial accident in a Redford Township tool shop has made medical history of sorts.

David Nail, 30, of 910 Tyndall, Plymouth, becomes the second successful thumb reimplantation in Michigan. The operation was performed in William Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak, where the first reimplantation also occurred in 1974.

THE ACCIDENT happened in the Lex Tool and Machine Co. in Redford

Township, a shop owned by Nail's father, William Nail.

Nail had his thumb bandaged because of an earlier fracture. While working on the lathe, the bandage got caught in the machine and his thumb got completely ripped off.

The father first rushed his son to Redford Community Hospital. Doctors there asked the father to return to the tool shop and retrieve the thumb. The thumb was found still in the lathe and was returned to Redford Hospital where it was packed in ice and sent to

Beaumont along with Nail for the surgery. Surgery was performed at Beaumont within five hours of the accident.

DR. ROBERT POOL, chief of plastic surgery at Beaumont, reports a team of surgeons reattached the thumb through microsurgery.

Performing the operation, which took less than three hours, were: Dr. Sri Ram, plastic surgery specialist; Dr. Thomas Magnell, orthopedic specialist in hand surgery; Dr. Prayote Buddhirakul, first-year resident in plastic surgery; and Dr. Peter M. Boruta, second-year resident in orthopedic surgery.

Microsurgery is surgical repair performed under magnification with a microscope. The first Michigan thumb reimplantation was performed by Dr. Ram at Beaumont in June, 1974, when an 18-year-old lost his thumb in an industrial accident. He has since returned to full employment. Only about

100 such operations have been performed in the U.S. thus far.

Ram reports Nail now has a "living thumb" and will have significant use of it.

Expecting to return to work in three to five months, Nail says the future looks very good. He added that doctors were very pleased with the operation. Nail and wife Marilyn have two children—Lisa, 9, and Jennifer, 1½.

RAM SAID the thumb was completely ripped off.

"We reattached the thumb and put back blood vessels under magnification. We didn't expect the thumb to survive because it was badly injured. The patient had a compound fracture of this same thumb before this injury. For that reason, we didn't think it would survive."

Ram said Nail will need surgery later to replace tendon and nerves severed in the lathe accident.

Schools juggle bus schedules

Some of the buses are overcrowded with students in the Plymouth Community School District because of a delay in delivery of 11 new buses.

At present, about 42 buses are operating to transport some 7,200 students being bused to school in the district.

The maximum load for most buses is 66 with three students per seat. The administration reports that many of the buses going to the Centennial Educational Park are the most overcrowded trips in the district.

In commenting on the over-crowded bus situation, Robert Houghton, supervisor of transportation, says: "We are juggling every day trying to adjust routes with the time element and equipment we have at hand."

"Equipment that was due in July will not be here until October or November. At that time, we will put new units on the road to lighten loads and get back on schedule."

The administration is continuing to negotiate with the bus manufacturer to obtain as speedy delivery on the 11 new buses as possible.

Proceeds from the league are earmarked for the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra.

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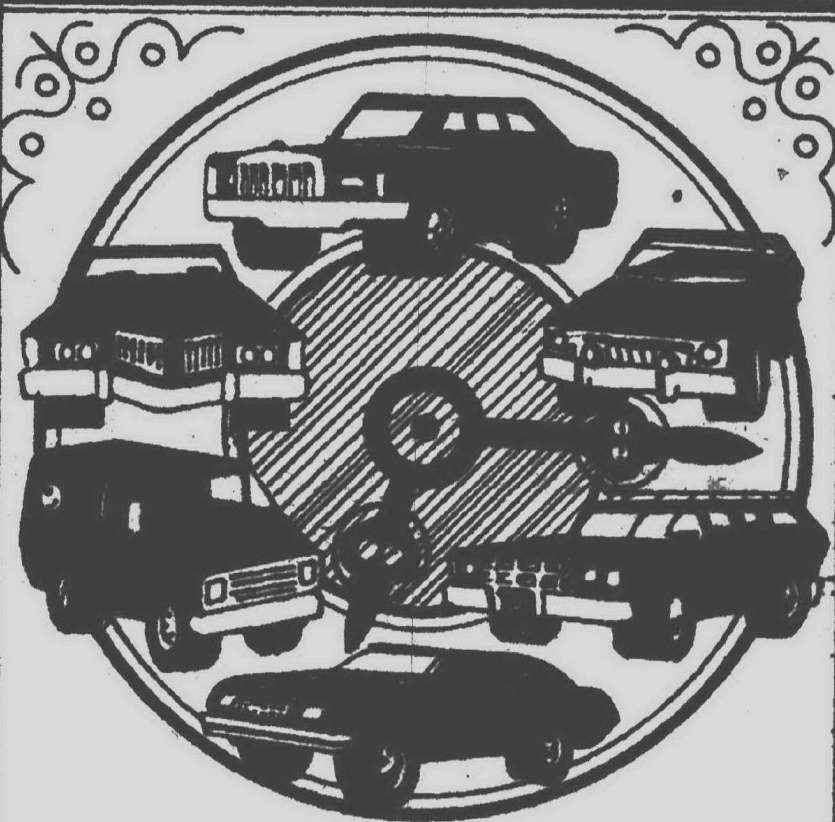
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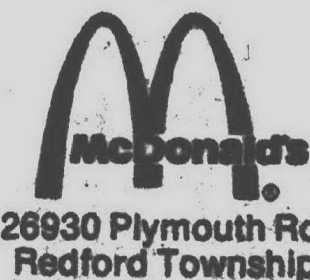

A curious gift revs up community

It was a curious gift: A side-by-side bicycle system with four wheels, two seats and two sets of handlebars.

But Hank Chrucial of the Western Wayne County Conservation Association routinely set to work checking out and reconditioning the gift, which came from Mrs. T.E. Gibson of 32310 Queensboro, Farmington Hills.

Usually, Chrucial's committee work involves helping Michigan Indians with gifts of toys, clothing and food. He took the Italian-made, canopied bike to a loyal friend, Fred Dzendzel, at Reliable Bicycle, 28860 Seven Mile, Livonia.

"This was intended for the blind, the visually handicapped, or even the physically handicapped," said Dzendzel, whose name might be familiar because he's the brother of the former state legislator.

THAT PUT a different light on the matter.

Chrucial called the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers office and asked where there was a program for the visually handicapped that might make use of a side-by-side bike and several other pieces of play equipment.

"It sounds like we can use it," said Dr. Nancy Bryant, superintendent of the Michigan School for the Blind at 715 W. Willow, Lansing, in response to an Observer & Eccentric inquiry. A former Plymouth resident, Dr. Bryant had heard of the conservation group.

Chrucial and an associate, John Bonk of Plymouth, loaded a pickup truck with the bike and other toys. They had some time on their hands, Chrucial because of a back injury and Bonk because of minor surgery, so Ray Gay, who runs a Sunoco station on Seven Mile in Livonia, helped out with a tank of gasoline.

ONE MORNING last week, the conservation club men were greeted at the school for the blind by Dr. Bryant and her staff. The school today is richer by:

Two sidewalk bikes, three tractors, a fire chief car, three tricycles, three wagons, two fire engines, a Wonder Horse, and five other bike-type toys that children can either pedal or push around the playground.

Not to mention the curious side-by-side bicycle that started it all.

OTHER TOYS went to a program at the Plymouth Center for Human Development in Northville Township.

There, in the Sullivan Hall for the blind and deaf-blind retarded, Dr. Dena Gruman was given custody of 20 vehicles (trikes, bikes with training wheels, Big Wheels), six artificial Christmas trees, pinball games and squeeze toys that can be used in physical therapy.

The toys are all new or nearly new but "seconds" the conservation group gets from area retailers. With a few spare parts and repairs, the toys are made virtually new. Apprentices in Ironworkers Local 25 help.

In fact, Chrucial says he could use some used bikes if they're in very good condition. An ironworker, he plans to convert them into more side-by-side bikes for the school for the blind.

The Indians haven't been forgotten. In his home at 18945 Broadwood, Livonia, Chrucial points to boxes of toys and ornaments—these are for the Indians at L'Anse, and these are for the mission school.

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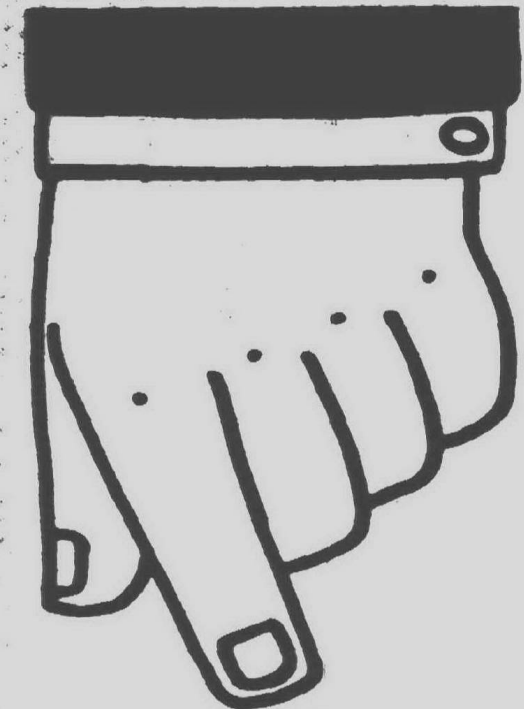

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Lights to brighten Ann Arbor Road

The erection of high-powered street lamps along the Ann Arbor Road corridor may soon give an extra bonus to motorists traveling on the widened road.

Members of the Plymouth City Commission last week approved by a 4-3 vote the installation of 35 high pressure sodium street lights, attached to existing Detroit Edison poles by 16-foot arms, for a cost of \$12,250.

COMMISSIONERS Norbert Battermann, John Cummings and John Moehle cast votes against the expenditure and favored installation of less expensive mercury vapor lights.

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees has already approved the installation of 35 sodium vapor lights on the township side of Ann Arbor Road for nearly \$70,000.

The township's request for new metal poles and underground wiring accounts for the difference in street lighting price tags for the two municipalities.

CITY ENGINEER Alan Gove said existing wooden poles, carrying high-

voltage Detroit Edison wires on the northern side of Ann Arbor Road, cannot be removed. Commissioners chose to take advantage of the poles and the less expensive price tag.

Gove cited the improved visibility and smaller energy consumption of the yellow-light high pressure sodium lamps, which, he says, are replacing mercury vapor lights in high-density areas.

"The new 60-foot pavement of Ann Arbor Road will require high-intensity lighting to safely illuminate the turning and merging traffic movements," he said.

Existing street lamps at the intersections of Ann Arbor Road will be removed, according to the engineer.

The lights will cost the city \$5,145 each year in energy charges and hike the city's current street lighting budget of \$70,000 about seven per cent. The lights will cost the township about \$8,500 each year in energy bills.

Detroit Edison will place the initial street lighting payments of the city and township in escrow funds to finance energy costs over the next few years, according to Gove.

Camp Fire Girls seeking members

The more than 200 Camp Fire Girls in this area have been passing the word around about the Camp Fire group in hopes of recruiting new members and adult participants.

SCHOOLS, libraries, community centers and places of business are displaying red, white and blue posters with the message "Say Yes to Camp Fire—Join Now."

Camp Fire leaders are also encouraging interested adults to attend the Camp Fire grand meeting on Oct. 1 at 7:30 p.m. in Plymouth Canton High Cafeteria. This meeting will be the finale of the past month of recruitment

and publicity in the Plymouth-Canton area.

"We are interested in recruiting adults to lead Camp Fire groups because there are many girls who could be a part of the program except for the lack of leadership," says Flossie Tonda of Plymouth.

"Working women are sought to give some of their time each month to Camp Fire. The council encourages men to consider Camp Fire leadership—sharing in the education and recreation of their daughter and of other girls. College-age men and women, men and women who aren't parents, senior citizens—all are among those who could give service to Camp Fire."

THE CAMP FIRE program stresses small group experiences with groups averaging about 10 girls each.

The program offers girls opportunities to give service to the community, to learn skills, to make friends, to have fun, to become aware of the needs of others, and to go camping year-round.

Camp Wathana, the Camp Fire's resident facility near Holly, has 380 acres of woods and lakes and is open 12 months for resident, group and family camping.

Camp Fire is a member agency of the United Foundation.

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Glenn shuts out Churchill, 21-0

Fred Shoemaker looks a whole lot better in a track suit than in football togs.

At 5-8 and 146 pounds, the speedster from John Glenn looks out of place among the giants of the gridiron. But Friday afternoon, amidst an on-again, off-again drizzle that would have messed the footing of a mountain goat, Shoemaker showed that he had to make no excuses for his size on a football field as he rushed for 113 yards in 24 carries and two touchdowns to lead the Rockets to a 21-0 victory over Livonia Churchill.

"Freddie's super," said John Glenn Coach Lloyd Carr after his team's second victory in as many outings.

"He not only is exceptionally quick, but he's gutsy. He's not afraid to get hit."

THE CREDIT for the win extends, of course, beyond the senior Shoemaker who is among the fastest dashmen in the area when the season turns.

The John Glenn defense has been making li of China lately as it has been unscored upon since the first quarter of the season when Garden City West pushed across a touchdown in Glenn's opening day, 9-7 victory over the Tigers.

And besides the string of seven shut-

out quarters, the first-liners on defense can boast that they did not allow the explosive Chargers to cross mid-field all game.

Only in the waning minutes, with the second string for both teams in, did Churchill threaten.

Despite the inept offensive showing by Churchill, the game remained in contention until midway through the final period.

Shoemaker accounted for the entire scoring in the first three quarters when he scampered in over left end from 10 yards out on the Rockets' initial possession.

The TD capped a 10-play, 74-yard drive. Midway through the drive, Glenn quarterback Todd Deluca hit George Roberts with a 23-yard pass to put the Rockets in scoring position.

Shortly after that play, Mike Welch had seemingly ended the Rocket momentum with an interception, but a Charger lineman had jumped the snap on the play, so Glenn had five yards and another chance.

Toward the end of the second quarter, Glenn threatened again, marching from midfield in the final 4:11 of the half. When Deluca hit Greg Thompson with a sideline pass on the Churchill two yard line with 38 seconds remaining, it appeared that there was only a Shoemaker fake and plunge between a one and two touchdown Glenn lead.

The Churchill defense rose up to stop Shoemaker for no gain, however, and with 22 seconds left, Glenn coach Carr opted for a field goal.

AFTER A PANDEMONIUM of bodies moving on and off the field as the clock ticked off the vital seconds, Deluca's kick was up and straight through the uprights.

Glenn, however, had used 12 players on the play and that infraction cost them the field goal which would have put the game out of reach of a Charger touchdown.

The third quarter was both a comedy of Churchill errors and a tragedy of lost opportunity for the Rockets.

Matt Foster, in punt formation, did not handle the snap from center and, with 8:51 remaining in the game, Glenn took indisputable charge of matters when Jack Henderson fell on the ball for a Rocket touchdown.

On its next possession, Glenn marched for 48 yards in seven plays against a Churchill defense which had obviously had enough of the Westland

visitors. Shoemaker powered over from two yards out for the final scoring of the game.

With substitutions in evidence throughout, Churchill mounted its only march of the day but fell four yards short when time expired.

"Let's face it, Glenn outdid us and outthrustled us," said Charger Coach Kaestner. "They deserved to win."

"When you can shut out a team as good as this Churchill squad, you know you must be doing something right on defense," Glenn Coach Carr countered.

Both teams swing into league action next week as Glenn hosts Thurston in a Northwest Suburban tilt and Churchill travels to Northville in an early Western Six showdown.

Thomas got one, Sieczkowski added another yard and Thomas rammed to the two. Humphrey then called on Rob Taraskavage for the field goal attempt from the nine-yard line and the junior's left-footed kick sailed off to the right.

East's only other real threat came in the pouring rain with two minutes left in the game. Kozlowski, who punted well all night, booted to the East 26-yard line with just 1:35 left in the game.

Senior Russ Hodges passed for 137 yards and two touchdowns Friday to lead Livonia Bentley to a 21-0 football victory over Allen Park.

Of the 125 yards Bentley picked up on the ground, Hodges was responsible for 76 of them in just five carries.

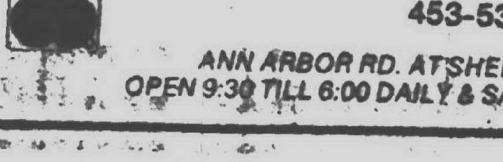
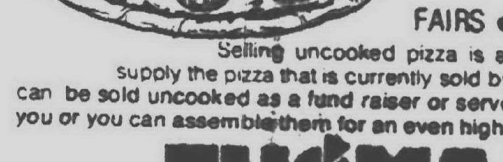
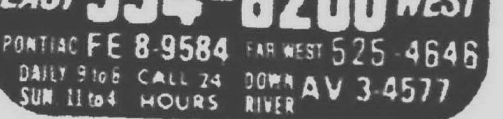
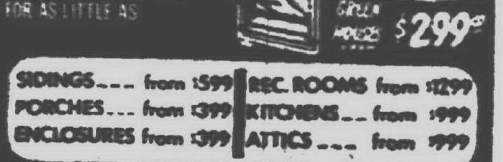

Lewis capped a five-play drive by taking the ball in himself from three yards out.

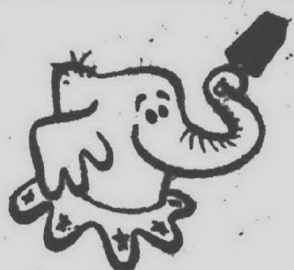
Brian Garber came back to tie the game for the Eagles late in the open-

Chiefs smash Annapolis to even record

Winning football requires balance, and Plymouth Canton carried out that maxim perfectly Friday.

The offense scored twice and the defense scored twice as the Chiefs spread things around in their 27-7 pasting of Dearborn Heights Annapolis. The victory evened Canton's season

mark at 1-1 while Annapolis fell to 0-2 on the year.

Co-captain Jim Tiller played and scored both ways to lead the Chiefs and senior back Mike Ogden wracked up 117 yards in 18 carries and another touchdown as Canton came back from

a lethargic first half to win going away.

Tiller evaded two tacklers and dived into the end zone, and Dave Pink added the conversion kick to tie things.

Pink, who plays end as well as handling the place-kicking chores for the Chiefs, was injured shortly after when he injured his foot. Pink will be out indefinitely.

Tiller struck again for the Chiefs on their second possession of the second half when he hauled in a Tom Close pass and swept in from 20 yards out at the 9:59 mark of the third quarter to give Canton the lead permanently.

That play was set up by a Scott Gray fumble recovery.

Mike Ogden showed his stuff on the Chiefs' next possession. Ogden accumulated 37 of his 117 yards for the day in one play when cut inside and swept to the outside, breaking two tackles en route.

Meanwhile the Chief defense was keeping Annapolis in check and in the

fourth quarter, Canton began marching again. This time the drive was halted when the Chiefs fumbled on the Annapolis 25 yard line.

But on the next play, Jim Cole picked off a Peters pass in the left flat and scurried down the sideline for the score. Bob Yauck, subbing for Pink as a place kicker, had made his first conversion but missed here.

In the final four minutes of the game, the Cougars marched from their own five to the Canton 18 yard

line but the clock expired before any damage was done.

"We didn't get into any rah-rah stuff in the lockerroom at halftime, but we seemed to be a bit more aggressive in the second half. We certainly jelled," Muneio said.

Canton takes on Farmington Harrison in its 2 p.m. Western Six opener next Saturday.

"They run well out of a power offense. We'll have our hands full," said Muneio.

A fourth down pass to John Horton set up the second Salem score. Howard Inch carried this one in for a 10-yard score to re-establish the Rocks six-point margin, 12-6.

Plymouth Salem controlled the play in the first half by virtue of its ball control offense which ran 45 plays to RU's 15.

With six minutes remaining in the third stanza Salem's Larry Rightler picked off an errant RU knuckleball and returned it to the 48.

The next play proved to be the clincher as Rightler, now playing offensive halfback, shed several Redford defenders on a 52-yard romp for Salem's final score.

Following that series, Redford Union moved 61 yards after Brian Macek picked up a Plymouth fumble.

It seemed that all quarterback Mike Petch had to do was throw the ball in the direction of the Rock secondary and wait for a yellow flag.

Salem was called for three consecutive pass interference violations.

The drive was capped, ironically, by a six-yard touchdown pass to Mark Ryder to make the final 18-12. The Redford score marked the first time since 1973 that Redford Union had scored two touchdowns against a Suburban Eight opponent.

Minutes later the anticipation of the Rocks' first win was dampened when quarterback Steve Maisner suffered a shoulder injury.

The full extent of Maisner's injury will not be known until x rays are taken, however the injury did appear to be serious.

Salem will take on Sub 8 favorite Trenton away next Friday while RU is home to Dearborn.

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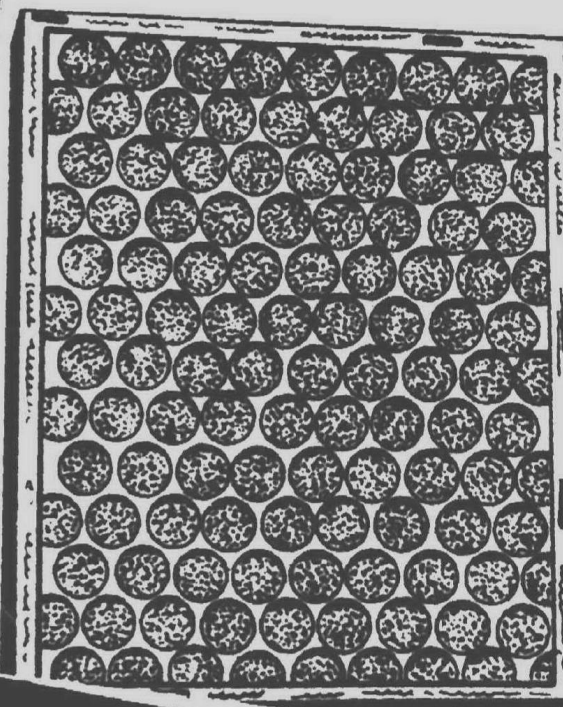
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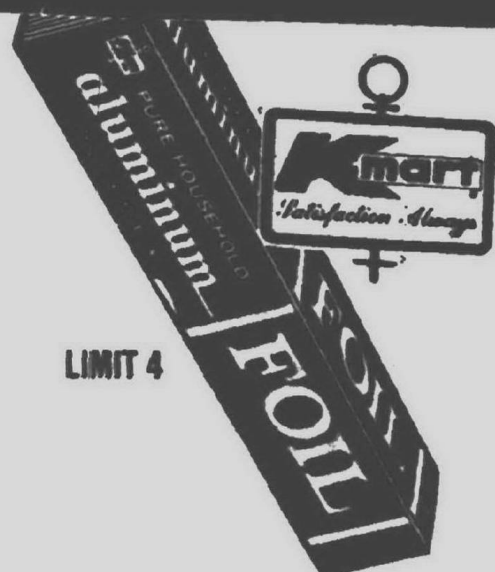

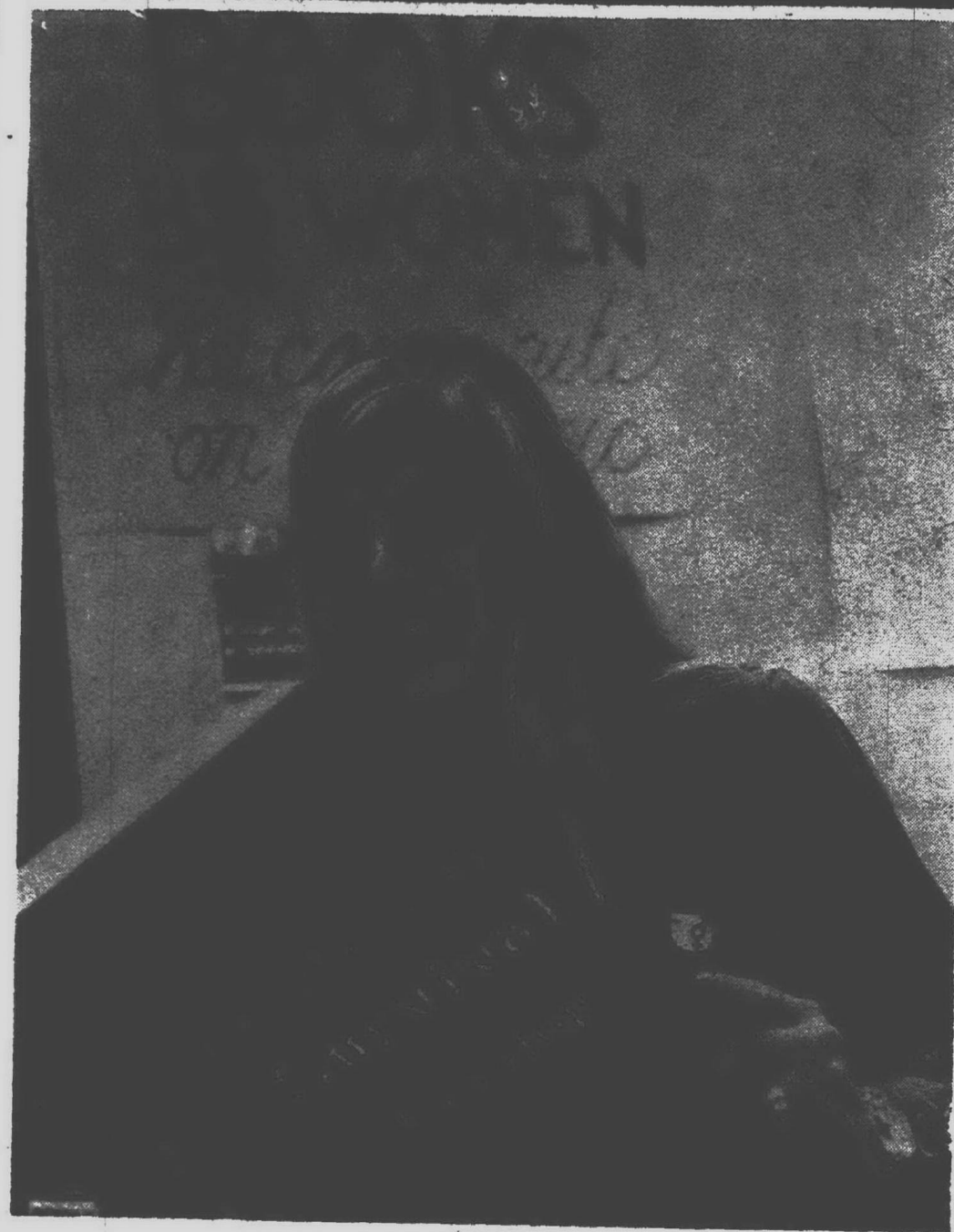

Woman's world is wide, festival shows

"I won't see in my lifetime, even in the United States, the day when women have full equality with men."

"But all over the world there is a feeling of unrest, change, awakening. Women are realizing more and more they are over-educated and under-used. This won't be true forever."

The words are those of Patricia Burnett, an organizer for the National Organization for Women, and she said them in a talk that highlighted Schoolcraft College's two-day International Women's Year festival.

Ms. Burnett was talking about the women she had seen while traveling around the world to look at woman's conditions in many countries.

But she need not have gone that far. The same evidence could be seen on campus as several hundred women converged for the two days of seminars, demonstrations, exhibits and just comparing notes.

IT WAS A FESTIVAL of celebration: the displays on the accomplishment of local women, the bookshelves with women's writings in all fields, the art work by women, the music brought to the campus by Ursula Walker and Linda Small attested to that.

But the knowledge that there's yet a long way to go was present too.

Women who have played varying roles in politics came through with the message that a woman has to work harder to get elected and nearly always works harder after she's in office.

"You have to be prepared to lick a lot of envelopes, and then realize you'll carry more of the load," was how a couple of speakers put it.

A panel of women who talked about non-traditional careers were agreed they are getting better acceptance from their male counterparts.

But one young woman who has a building business mentioned a banker's surprise that "I had my whole package put together."

"I guess he expected me to ask directions," she added.

WOMAN'S PLACE in the world represented by the younger generation came in for consideration too.

A panel of young men indicated they were well satisfied with the new social scene of more casual dating and more equality for the sexes, but wondered if equality on the job market wasn't going to pose a threat to them.

Women who had returned to school indicated they're still working out the question of who minds the house while mom studies, and one career woman left—just a bit reluctantly—to get dinner instead of hearing Ms. Small's top-flight jazz.

"It still comes down to the fact that it's your job to do that, no matter what else you do," she commented.

One discussion of no unrest was the one that stressed creative homemaking. Its participants, in varying stages of life, said they found plenty of variety in their homemaker roles and found ample outlets for creativity while caring for their families.

MS. BURNETT, in her travelog talk, looked at the roles of women in other parts of the world and concluded that "this country is the most progressive."

Russian women, she said in her talk illustrated by slides, "are quite well off in the matter of equality with men," but she found deplorable the condition of the Iranian women who learn as small children to veil their faces in public, and many of the others she met.

The speaker, a member of the Michigan Commission on Women, said she felt sure that the 1976 bicentennial year would see passage of the Equal Rights Amendment to the Constitution.

"If it doesn't pass soon," she said, "we could have a real revolution."

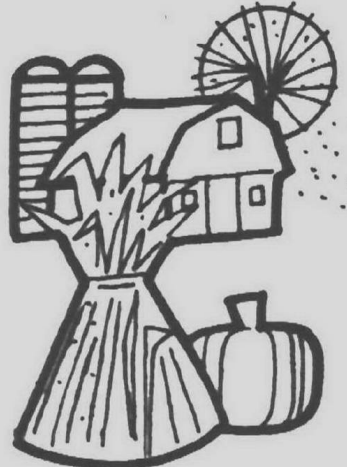

Memories of area span her 95 years

Grace Bennett remembers well the days when she was living in Plymouth and watching with interest the building of a new landmark, the Mayflower Hotel.

She and her banker husband, Edgar K. Bennett, attended the hotel's opening in November, 1927.

And last week Mrs. Bennett, now living in a senior citizen home in Wayne, was back in the Mayflower, for a luncheon to celebrate her 95th birthday.

"It's so changed now," she told her niece, Beverly Schmitt of Livonia. "Really fixed up beautifully."

After the birthday luncheon, Mrs. Schmitt had a small party for her aunt in her home on Scone Avenue.

Guests on hand to help cut the bur-

thday cake included Bessie Holloway, Mrs. Bennett's sister, now a resident of Presbyterian Village in Redford Township.

"She's seven years younger than I," said the birthday lady. "She was the youngest of our family: I was the oldest."

THE WOMEN, part of a large family headed by William and Blanche Robinson, grew up on a farm that now is part of Canton Township.

They went to a one-room schoolhouse a mile and a half from their home and then to Wayne for high school.

Grace trained as a dressmaker, but did not practice her profession while living in Plymouth.

"My husband didn't want me to work," she explained.

She did sew professionally, though, after she moved to Detroit following his death about 40 years ago. During a stay at the King's Daughters retirement home, she said, "I made things for all the ladies."

NOW SHE STILL makes some of her own clothes—she took time out from the 95th birthday festivities to ask her niece to select some material for her soon—and she continues to do fine needlepoint, embroidery and crochet work.

Her recipe for a life full of years? "Just good clean living and keep happy," she said. "And come from a long-lived family."

Mrs. Bennett said her grandfather lived to the age of 95, too.

"And as my birthday was getting close, she added, "I kept thinking so often of my dear mother who wanted so much to reach that age, but missed it by six months."

"I wish she could have reached 95 as I did."


