## Sparse crowd attends school budget hearing

The public hearing on a \$17 million school budget was conducted Monday night by the Plymouth Board of Education with less than 20 persons, including school district employees, in the audience.

The \$17.4 million budget presented at the public hearing provides a reserve for contingencies of \$83,500. Ray Hoedell, assistant superintendent of business, cautioned that this contingency is "precariously low" because another cut in state aid is anticipated which could reduce revenues by up to \$143,000.

IN A BUDGET message to the community, Superintendent John M. Hoben said:

"In the past 10 years, the Plymouth Community School District has truly become 'Big Business.'"

"In that period the student enrollment has doubled and the budget has increased from \$3.6 million to \$17.4 million. The district's operating budget—expressed in cost per student—has increased 146 per cent in 10 years: from \$527 per student in 1965-66 to \$1,298 in 1975-76.

"Larger enrollments, significant improvements in teacher compensation and the introduction of new programs and services are among the factors accounting for this sharp rise in costs. Others are efforts to maintain teacher-student ratios and the 'overall problem' of how much more to budget for inflation.

"The 1975-76 operating budget represents a conscientious effort on behalf of the board of education and staff to maintain our school district's strike towards educational quality and excellence."

THE DISTRICT'S revenues this year will increase by about 15 per cent from last year and expenditures will increase about 12 per cent compared to a 17 per cent increase in expenditures last year.

General state aid for 1975-76 will be \$152.40 per student compared to \$197.40 per student last year, a decrease of \$45 per student. Expressed in total dollars, the district this year will receive \$470,653 less in state membership aid even though enrollment has climbed by six per cent, from 12,656 to 13,415.

The tax base, as equalized by the state, has increased by \$84,990 (21.6 per cent) to almost \$479 million for a wealth per student of \$35,680.

The increased tax base will generate an extra \$2.6 million in revenue based on 29.01 mills levied for operation.

The local tax levy accounts for some 74 per cent of the district's total revenue, with 20 per cent coming from general state aid.

The only areas in the proposed budget where there has been an actual decrease in dollars budgeted from last year's actual expenditures are in adult education and capital outlay. Budget classifications showing large

increases include special education and community services.

AMONG THE CUTS in the budget presented Monday night are:

A \$40,000 reduction by cutting the budget for substitute teachers district-wide from \$135,000 to \$95,000.

Reducing five custodial positions and enacting a new energy conservation committee to cut utility costs. There are presently no lay-offs in the budget.

Capital outlay has been decreased by almost \$23,000.

The proposed new hockey program, girls' golf and girls' gymnastics weren't included in the proposed budget.

Teaching supplies have been reduced by eight per cent in each building for an expected savings of about \$52,000. The board has also decided against hiring an assistant superintendent of instruction until at least July 1, 1976 for a savings of \$30,000.

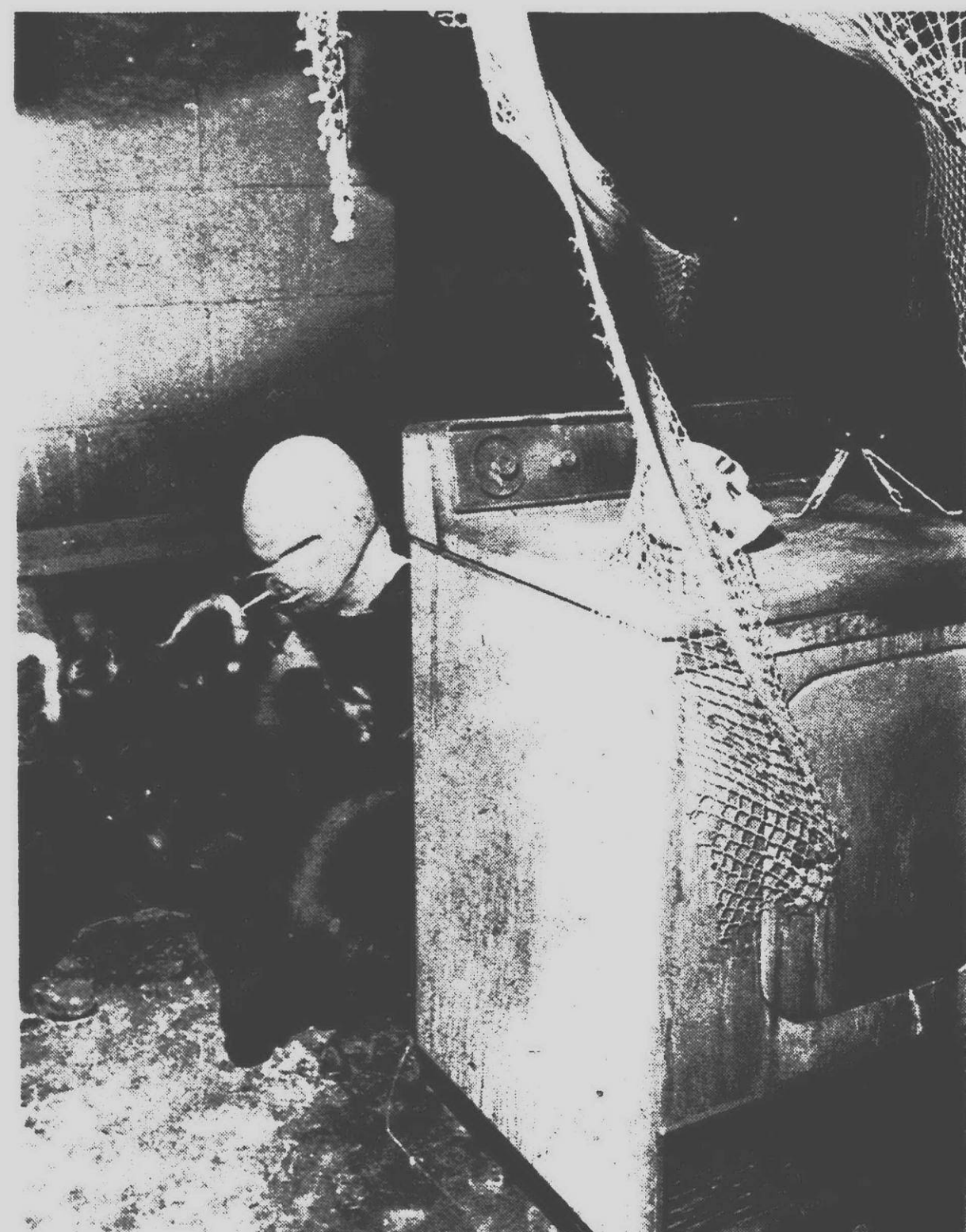
THERE WAS an effort at Saturday morning's special meeting on the budget to add girls' golf this year, but that effort was defeated by a 3-1 vote.

Marcia Borowski, board vice-president, voted no because she felt money for the program should come from within the existing athletic budget instead of increasing the athletic budget to begin the sport. Trustees Gary Minto and Tom Yack were absent and Trustee Dr. E.J. McClendon had left before the vote was taken.

At Monday night's hearing, Borowski complained that the athletic budget had increased by 11 per cent without any new programs being added.

"We are cutting teaching supplies, why aren't we cutting uniforms or other sports equipment? We are cutting library aides, why aren't we cutting assistant coaches? We are cutting educational field trips, why aren't we cutting costs of transportation?"

## Annexation request is stalled by state appeals legal ruling

The City of Plymouth's petition to annex the Burroughs Corp. parking lot is being held in abeyance by the State Boundary Commission pending legal clarification on the constitutional authority of the boundary commission on annexation matters.

The boundary commission had made a unanimous decision, verbally, to approve the city's petition to annex the Burroughs parking lot from Plymouth Township.

But before the written order could be prepared, the Michigan Court of Appeals last week ruled that a section in state law giving the boundary commission control over annexation is unconstitutional.

APPELATE JUDGES Victor J. Brennan, Donald E. Holbrook and Michael J. Cavanagh last week ruled that a 1970 amendment to the Home Rule Cities Act of 1909 was unconstitutional.

The amendment sought to transfer authority in boundary disputes between home rule cities and townships from cities and county commissions to the Michigan Boundary Commission (MBC).

The amendment gives MBC power to decide annexation petitions without support of a public vote among residents affected when the targeted area has less than 100 residents.

The Home Rules Cities Act originally limited MBC's power to settling in-

corporation and consolidation petitions.

The appellate court ruled the amendment violates the Michigan Constitution because it "purports to change the jurisdiction of the MBC, which is outside the title of the 1970 amendment and the title of the Home Rule Cities Act."

"Those interested in the authority and jurisdiction of the MBC could hardly be expected to realize that a change was being made in another act, the title of which has to do with Home Rule Cities," the court said.

The constitution forbids the legislature from passing laws unclear to lawmakers and the public, the court noted, and also requires legislators to notify the public about statutory changes.

The court also said the legislature unconstitutionally amended the State Boundary Commission Act without first re-enacting and republishing the act.

JAMES S. HYDE, executive secretary of the MBC, said the Plymouth annexation already adjudicated is now in limbo, as are two other annexation petitions filed by the city—one to annex the entire township and the other to annex the Hillside Inn property in Plymouth Township.

"Everything is up in the air now," says Hyde. "I won't know how the appellate court ruling affects us until we are advised by our attorney, Craig Atchinson, of the state attorney general's office."

"It's still undecided whether the attorney general will appeal the ruling to the Michigan Supreme Court."

"If there is an appeal, it isn't yet known what our role would be during litigation. If there isn't an appeal, the whole question is moot. I'd have to assume all pending annexation petitions would be treated as if they never existed. At least that's my understanding."

Atchinson says the attorney general's office is expected to decide whether to appeal by the end of next week.

FRED YOCKEY, Plymouth city manager, comments that the attorney general is faced with a dilemma on this issue because a number of state laws are passed by reference to an existing law, which is the central question addressed by the appellate court.

"Thus far, the appellate decision doesn't affect the city's annexation requests until we find out if it will be appealed. If it remains that the amendment is unconstitutional, we'll have to wait and see what develops in Lansing," he said.

## New state bill resparks sanitation authority hopes

Plymouth-Canton residents could pay less for garbage pick up and disposal in future years, if hopes of the Intergovernmental Council are realized.

Council members, who represent the City of Plymouth, the Plymouth Community School District and Canton, Plymouth Salem and Superior townships, may examine the possible establishment of an areawide sanitation authority, proposed to revive or replace an authority now inactive for two years.

THE AUTHORITY, as envisioned by local officials, would provide more efficient and less costly garbage disposal services to residents through possible areawide establishment of a disposal plant, recycling program or joint garbage pickup plan.

Monetary issues, however, could act as a roadblock, checking the discussions and plans of intergovernmental members.

The Western Wayne County Sanitation Authority, established several years ago by the cities of Plymouth and Northville and Canton, Plymouth and Northville townships, attained an inactive status when financial issues became paramount.

The inability of townships to levy taxes for sanitation without a referendum vote paved the pathway of the authority's demise, according to Gene Overholt, former Plymouth Township trustee and chairman of the sanitation authority.

"The authority was chartered, and we even had contacted different organizations for garbage pick up," Overholt said. "The place where we got bogged down was in the area of townships being able to charge for pickup purposes."

"In all cases, the townships had had millages defeated for other reasons. The climate may have changed, but, at that time, any tax increases at the local level would have been impossible."

Rumors of a new state law, giving townships the right to tax for sanitation purposes without a vote of the people, recently revived intergovernmental hopes of establishing an authority.

But, according to bonding attorney George Stevenson, a member of the Detroit law firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock & Stone, the law generally does not empower townships to sell

sanitation bonds without a referendum vote.

Townships may only take such action, Stevenson said, when a court or the Michigan Water Resources Commission orders the establishment of sanitation facilities to correct a pollution problem.

"The intent of the Legislature is that people can't avoid dealing with specific problems," Stevenson said. "Townships have no general authority to borrow money. Townships are authorized under various statutes to borrow money under certain conditions."

SOME LOCAL officials feel the intergovernmental committee could revive the area's defunct sanitation authority, even if a vote of township residents is required.

Richard Gornick, a Plymouth Township trustee and member of the Intergovernmental Council says many Plymouth Township residents would pay less money for garbage pickup purposes if a sanitation authority were established.

Township residents now pay about \$3.25 a month for garbage pick up contracts with individual companies, Gornick said. Taxes to finance a sanitation authority would probably only total about \$2.10 a month, he figures.

"I think it's a good thing," Gornick said of the sanitation authority, "but it would require the job of educating the people."

"The authority has long-term advantages too. We're slowly but surely run-

ning out of space for sanitary landfills, and there are recycling possibilities. What do you do with old tires and old cars? That's a problem."

Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein, another intergovernmental member, says he is willing to examine possible sanitation plans.

"I'd like to hear more about it," Greenstein said of the authority. "I'm very much in favor of intergovernmental cooperation. If I thought it was worth taking to the vote of the people, I'd do it."

Canton's annual garbage pickup bill, taken from the general fund, now totals about \$130,000, Greenstein said.

"I always thought it might be better if we had our own garbage pick up. Contractors make a profit. If you eliminate that, then it would cost a lot less money."

PLYMOUTH CITY Manager Fred Yockey, a former member of the Southeast Oakland County Incinerator Authority, cited numerous advantages of areawide sanitation plans, including economy of scale and the potential to establish disposal and recycling programs.

The city, Yockey said, currently contracts garbage pick up services to a private sanitation company. The city, allowed under law to levy a maximum three mills (\$3 per \$1,000 of state equalized value) for sanitation purposes, currently levies 1.52 mills for garbage pick up.

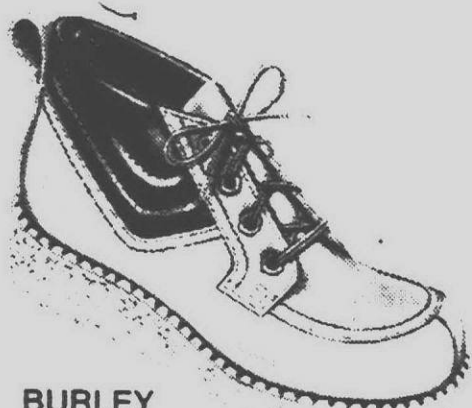

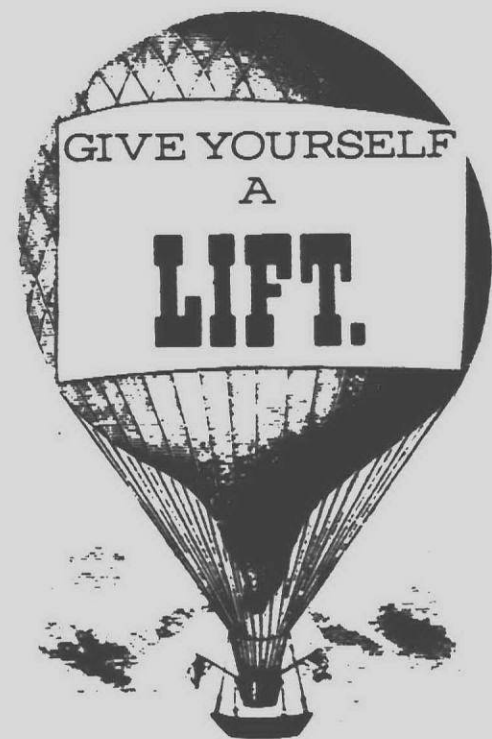

# Growthworks receives \$59,000 grant

Growthworks Inc. of Plymouth has received a grant of \$59,000 for a community development intervention and training program in the Plymouth-Canton area.

The grant from the U.S. Catholic Conference's campaign for human development will fund a training program for community segments now lacking organizing skills.

Growthworks is the merged parent organization of Youth Inc. and the crisis center Our House.

**THE PROGRAM**—called the Community Intervention Project—will establish community services responding to locally perceived human needs.

Economically disadvantaged people and young people will be trained in skills in identifying need areas and establishing projects and alternative services to meet those needs, explains Scott Levely of Youth Inc.

"These groups will also gain expertise at acquiring input into the direction the community's responsiveness is taking."

Growthworks now provides community services such as youth activities and guidance, student assistance, drug abuse and crisis counseling, and health care assistance.

Growthworks has, however, recognized a need in the southeastern Michigan area for more primary interventions at the community level rather than symptom-focused services.

"If the quality of life in southeastern Michigan is to begin and continue to be consistent with human needs," said a statement from Growthworks, "then local segments, citizens and community level institutions need more input into the direction of community development."

"Growthworks' Community Intervention Project is designed to develop and implement modes to give citizens and groups needed skills. As well as accomplishing local impacts, the program will pioneer a format which can be utilized in other communities."

**THE CAMPAIGN** for Human Development (CHD) is a national educational action program of the Catholic Church which has as a goal to impact on the quality of life in America today through education.

Local projects CHD funds are aimed at education of residents in carrying out self-help projects. Through community development education, CHD hopes to attack the root condi-

tions of poverty, powerlessness and alienation.

The fund is generated by donations from individual parishes. At least part of the money collected from the Detroit Archdiocese is returned to this area in the form of local grants.

IN AN announcement made this week, the CHD stated:

"Communities are more than congregations of people, collections of buildings and dwellings, streets, sewers and local governmental services. They should be instruments for meeting their member's needs. In the most basic sense, they should provide for the environmental and psychological well being of their members."

"In southeastern Michigan, this isn't happening. Human needs aren't being fulfilled. Even after massive expenditures of federal money, our communities are evidencing neglect of their human resource bases."

"Communities featuring new residential expansion and commercial edifices also show signs of human resource base erosion. Alarming increases in crime, suicide, increasing alcohol and drug abuse, chronic underemployment, and growing neighborhood deterioration indicate our continued inability to meet human needs through our communities."

Traditional social service efforts, the CHD stated, are geared to providing "aftercare" for symptoms instead of giving top priority to meeting a community's needs.

Counter-acting forces which make it difficult to meet need, instead of just treating symptoms, the CHD states, include: continued fragmentation of family; chronic underemployment of young people; inadequate work skill development; and, stratification of socio-economic groupings and isolation of young people from the rest of the community.

"Another questionable approach is our increasing reliance upon regional economic and governmental forces to fill the vacuum. Limited regional planning as practiced by Southeast Michigan Council of Governments has little to do with making communities needs-meeting places."

"Expansion of regional hegemony is no answer to our growing erosion of community."

"In fact, if regional forces such as those exacerbated by SEMCOG, continue their current direction, transitory suburban lifestyles, improper land use, residential sprawl, underemployment, and continued urban blight will increase within the region. Local communities, like our older suburbs, will find their options narrowing; they will meet human needs with less effectiveness."

IN A MICRO SENSE, CHD believes, local residents—not elites—need to understand their community's current needs, future opportunities and threats, to formulate their own com-

munity direction, and to determine operational goals.

In a larger sense, the agency believes, regional efforts should be aimed at stabilizing and revitalizing local

needs-meeting abilities as determined by local people.

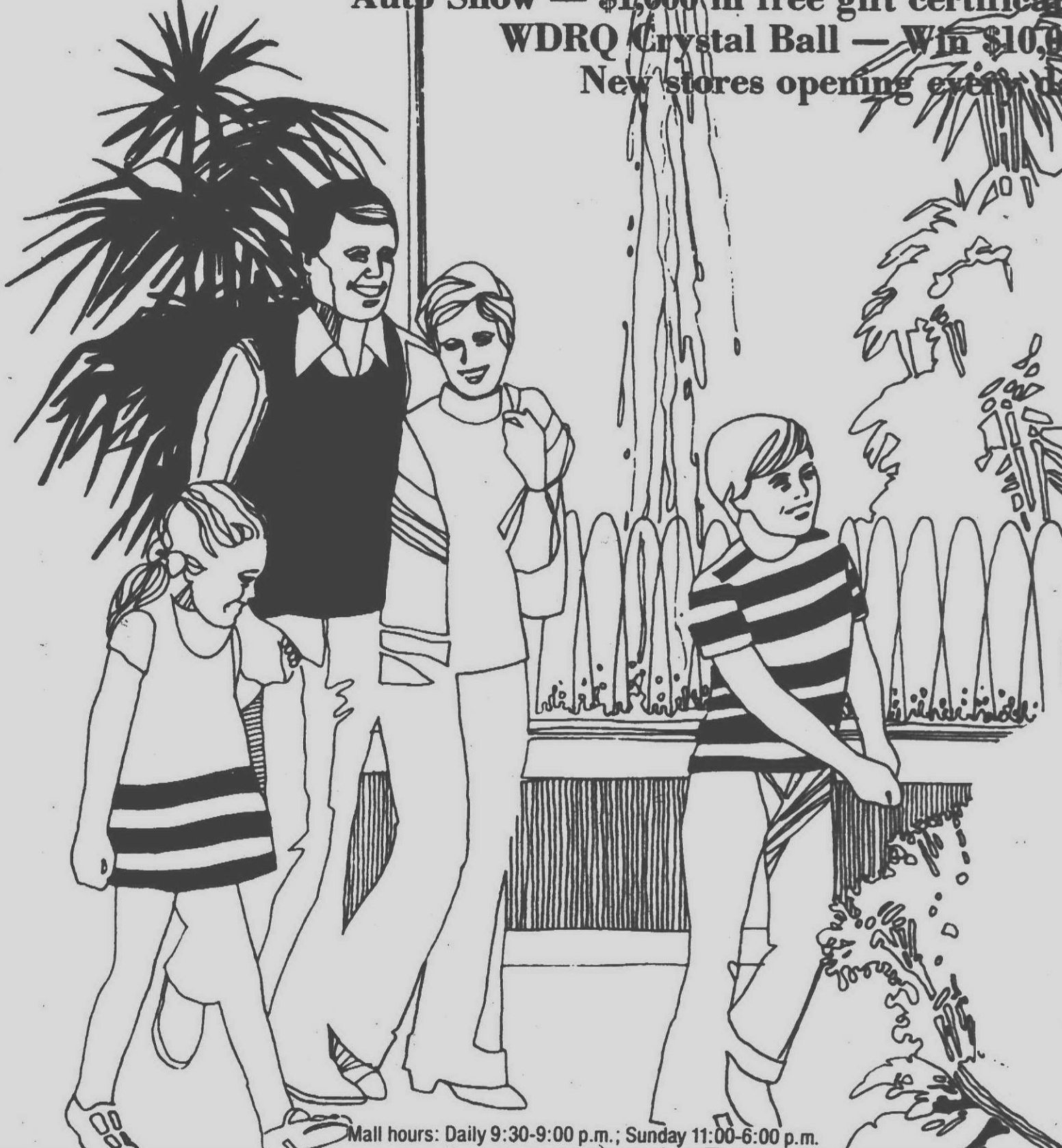
"The Community Intervention Project will focus on these concerns in the Plymouth-Canton area. Our function will be to facilitate the determination

of needs-meeting deficiencies and to begin the initial steps to fulfill those ends.

"This project is a monumental task, but without it the movement towards inadequate quality of life.

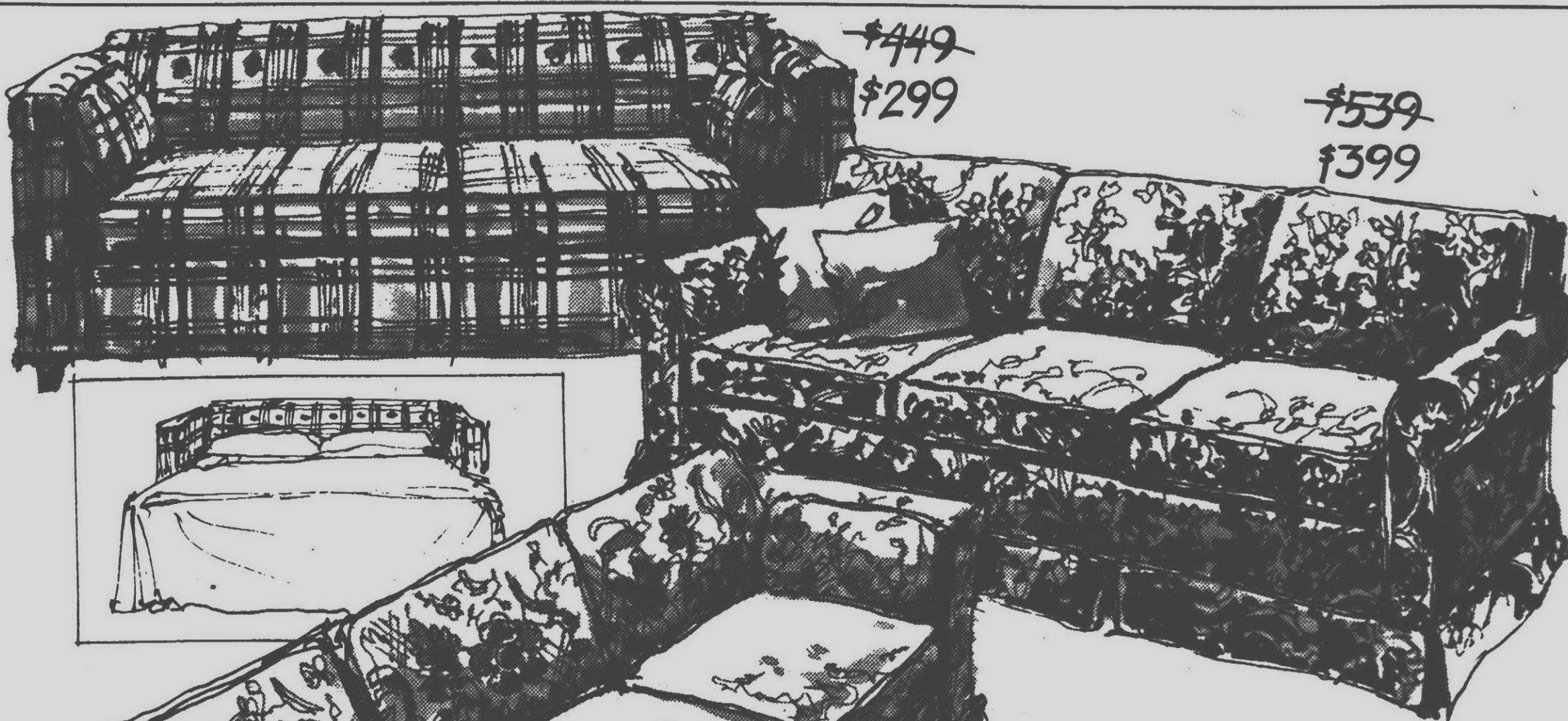

tion in athletics? We are cutting a lot in the budget, but only \$1,000 has been cut in the athletic budget? Surely there must be some areas that savings can be realized in the athletic budget."

"I'm not saying the athletic budget is a luxury one, but we aren't talking about increasing the number of kids each coach must serve, we aren't talking about cutting off the lights at the football field. We have cut inservice training for teachers by \$7,000 and have increased the amount budgeted for coaches' clinics."

Trustee Joe Gray said he found Borowski's comments very repetitious because the athletic budget was discussed for four to five hours at Saturday's session.

"We are working on a very small and very tight athletic budget," said Gray, "much smaller than in other school districts. We have added new girls' sports programs, and these programs cost more each year."

Hoben commented that last year girls' softball and volleyball were added at the middle school level, and girls' softball at the high school level, without any extra cost. These programs were absorbed into the regular athletic budget, he added, which cannot be done this year because it's a tight budget.

Trustee George Lawton said eliminating night football games to afternoon would mean a loss of about 3,500 spectators and a loss of \$15,000 in gate receipts. "It's unfair to consistently pick out the athletic budget as the whipping boy," Lawton added.

"I resent the suggestion I'm using the athletic budget as a whipping boy," Borowski responded. "The fact remains that the athletic budget hasn't been reduced by one penny from what the athletic director requested last spring. What's fair is fair, if we are going to cut let's cut everybody fairly."

The school board is expected to adopt the budget Monday Oct. 27, when it meets at 7:30 p.m. in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High.

Mrs. Folger said the band concerts would, of course, be a part of each program. There would be no admission charge or sale of items.

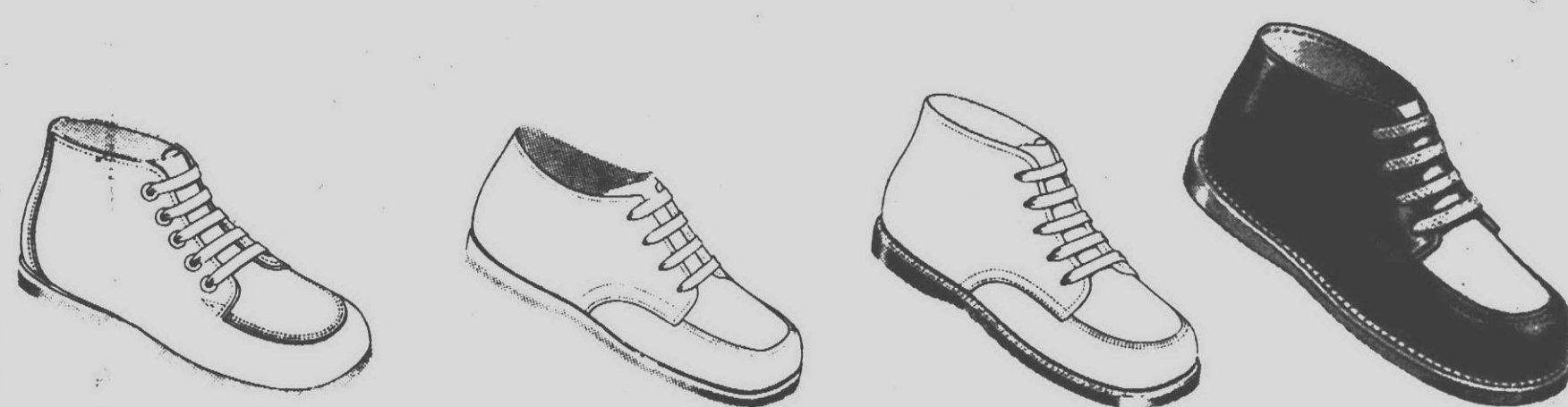

# Candidates file expense reports

Expense reports filed with the Wayne County Clerk's office shows that Scott Dodge was the top spender in the August primary election for Plymouth City Commission.

Dodge, who led the field in the primary, spent \$411.63.

Expenditures of other candidates were: Beverly McAninch, \$208.46; David Pugh, \$159.95; Thomas A. Turner, \$146.09; Les Howes, \$121.80; Mary

Childs, \$121.08; and Alfred H. Thoman Jr., \$109.90.

**EXPENDITURES** of the two candidates defeated in the primary were: Leonard Budnick, \$134.35; and Kenneth B. Kisabeth who reported no receipts and no disbursements.

As of Tuesday, Oct. 21, Commissioner John Cummings hadn't filed an expense report as required by law. The

county clerk has asked the county prosecutor's office to get Cummings to comply with the law and file a report.

John Yakush, special investigator, says Cummings mailed the report last week but it hasn't been received. Another copy was to have been made and mailed this week. "Cummings has promised in good faith to file the report and I expect he will. If not, I will take further action."

**NONE OF THE** candidates reported any individual contributions in excess of \$100 except for Budnick who received \$134.35 worth of bumper stickers and pencils from Jack Stasiuk Associates of Livonia in the form of a donation.

Eight persons contributed a total of

\$91 to McAninch's primary campaign. Childs reports receipts of \$60.58. All of Dodge's contributions were for less than \$100 and the receipts portion of the report states: "This was paid for by Scott H. Dodge personally."

Thomann lists no receipts. Turner reports receipts at less than \$100 but doesn't say from whom they were received, indicating they were from his personal funds. Howes reports no receipts, and Pugh reports one contribution of \$100.50 from himself and a contribution from an individual of \$59.45.

The Plymouth Civic Federation spent \$146.70 in educational programs and literature for the primary and received contributions of \$238.50, leaving a balance to be spent for the general election Nov. 4.

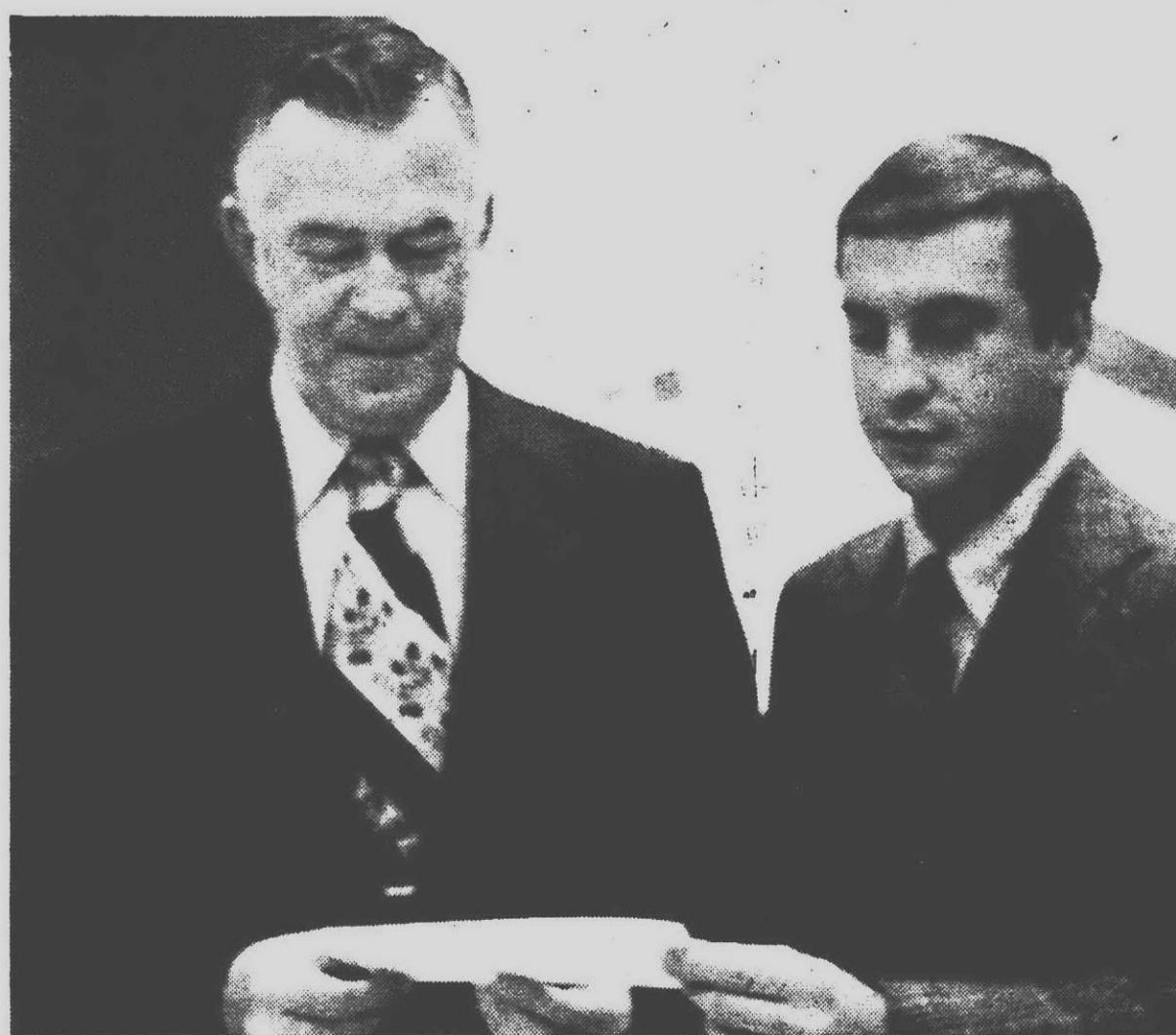

## Community Fund chairmen report

The Plymouth Community Fund drive, with a goal of \$230,000, had reached the 18 per cent mark when chairmen gave progress reports at a Monday luncheon.

Gil Forthofer, general chairmen of the drive, said cash donations totaled about \$35,000.

Laurina Badendiek reported the residential returns were \$1,043.15.

Industrial contributions are two per cent above last year's at this time. Chairman Jim Boyce has collected \$26,955 which is 22.8 per cent of his goal.

Carl Peterson reported \$987 from the business community and Robert Shuman added \$895 from the special gifts category.

**MARCIA BOROWSKI**, who is heading the educational division of the drive, reported \$3,057; Gary Hall, professional, \$1,030; and Arthur Mulligan, governmental, \$1,013.

This is the 31st annual Plymouth Community Fund drive according to Daisy Proctor, secretary-treasurer of the fund.

Mrs. Proctor said 98 per cent of the money collected will be used to benefit area residents. Just two per cent of the total is used for administration as compared to five per cent for the United Fund.

Some 60 Michigan United Way agencies are made available to the residents of Plymouth Township, City of Plymouth and Canton Township through the Plymouth fund.

"AGENCIES supported by the fund aid persons in all three communities," said Forthofer.

They are: American Red Cross, Michigan Cancer Foundation, Plymouth Junior Athletic Association, Boy Scouts, Plymouth Dental Fund, Senior Citizens, Salvation Army, Camp Fire Girls, Growth Works, Inc., and the Plymouth-Northville-Canton YMCA.

Twenty-eight per cent of the youngsters in the Junior Athletic Associ-

ation are from Canton Township, according to Mrs. Proctor.

The progress of the drive will be shown on the thermometer graph by the torch in Kellogg Park. After the original torch-lighting ceremony the flame was extinguished as an energy conservation measure.

## Fluorocarbons bill to floor

The U.S. House of Representatives Science and Technology Committee has approved the Rogers-Esch bill (H.R. 3118), which calls for a major study on the effects of fluorocarbons on the ozone layer of the earth's atmosphere.

The measure also calls for future regulations should the study confirm preliminary investigations relating to the harmful effects of fluorocarbons. Fluorocarbons are propellants used in spray cans.

U.S. Reps. Paul G. Rogers (D-Fla.),

chairman of the subcommittee on public health and environment of the Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee, and Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor), ranking minority member on the committee's environment and the atmosphere subcommittee, were the original sponsors of the legislation in the last session of Congress. Esch's district includes most of Livonia and Plymouth.

The bill will now go to the full house as part of the Clean Air Act which will come up for consideration in the next few weeks.

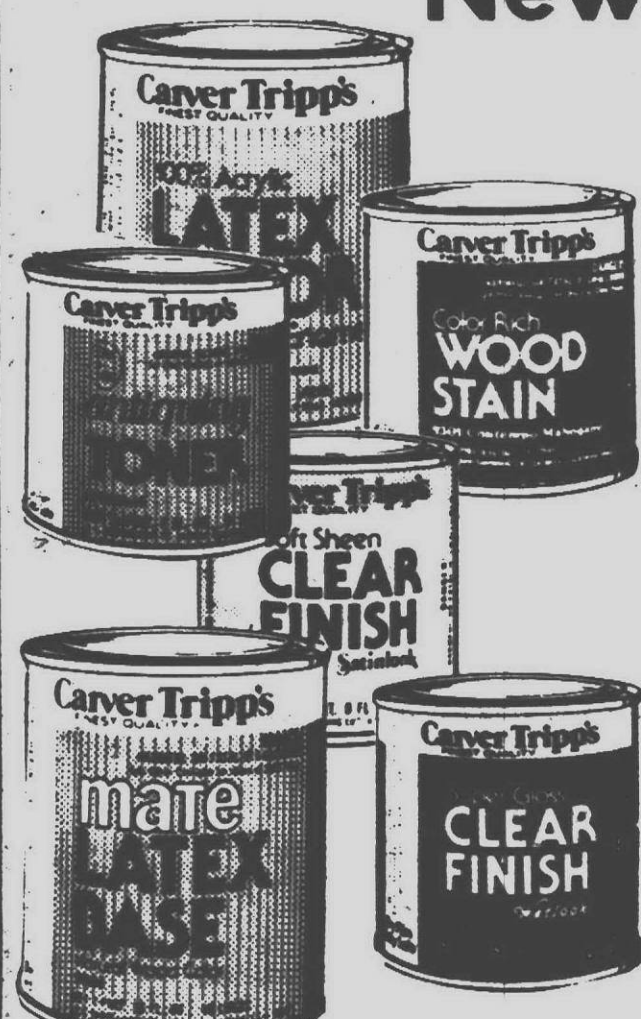

## 'Sin City' T-shirts being sold

A group calling themselves Concerned Students started selling "Sin City" T-shirts Monday at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) to inject humor into the controversy about modular scheduling at the Park.

The T-shirts are a reaction to a Channel 4 telecast shot at the CEP which was featured as "Sin City in the Suburbs." The language was picked up by the television station as an eye-catcher from a remark made by Plymouth Salem Principal Bill Brown that "this isn't sin city out here."

Four students, three seniors and one junior, have printed about 100 T-shirts which also bear a picture of a tree planted at the CEP.

The shirts are being sold for \$2 each, and cost about \$1.50 per shirt to make. They went on sale Monday and about 50 had been sold by Tuesday afternoon.

In on the project were Cindy Price, senior, Kevin Riley, junior, Kathy Delauro, senior, and Lynn Partin, a senior. The shirts were designed by Riley and Delauro and printed on silk screen in Price's basement. They aren't planning on making any more after the 100 are sold.

The students say the T-shirts are being sold as sort of a joke on the television broadcast and on those who report open sex is seen in the school.

The students encourage parents to tour the CEP at anytime and for as long as they want to see actions of students. "It is better to see with two eyes than just one," said Miss Price.

Students from both Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools have purchased the shirt with word getting around by word-of-mouth advertising.

The telecast upset a number of residents, especially leaders of Concerned Parents who stress that none of their members ever used the words "sin city" and that they object strongly to the station's "sensationalism."

"We only wanted them to come out for a telecast so we could make a

pitch for parents to volunteer for a survey we are taking on modular scheduling at the CEP," explains Mrs. Barbara Olson. "It was not our purpose to cast the school in a bad light and we were very unhappy with the telecast. The term sin city didn't come from our group but was picked up out of context from an innocent remark Brown made."

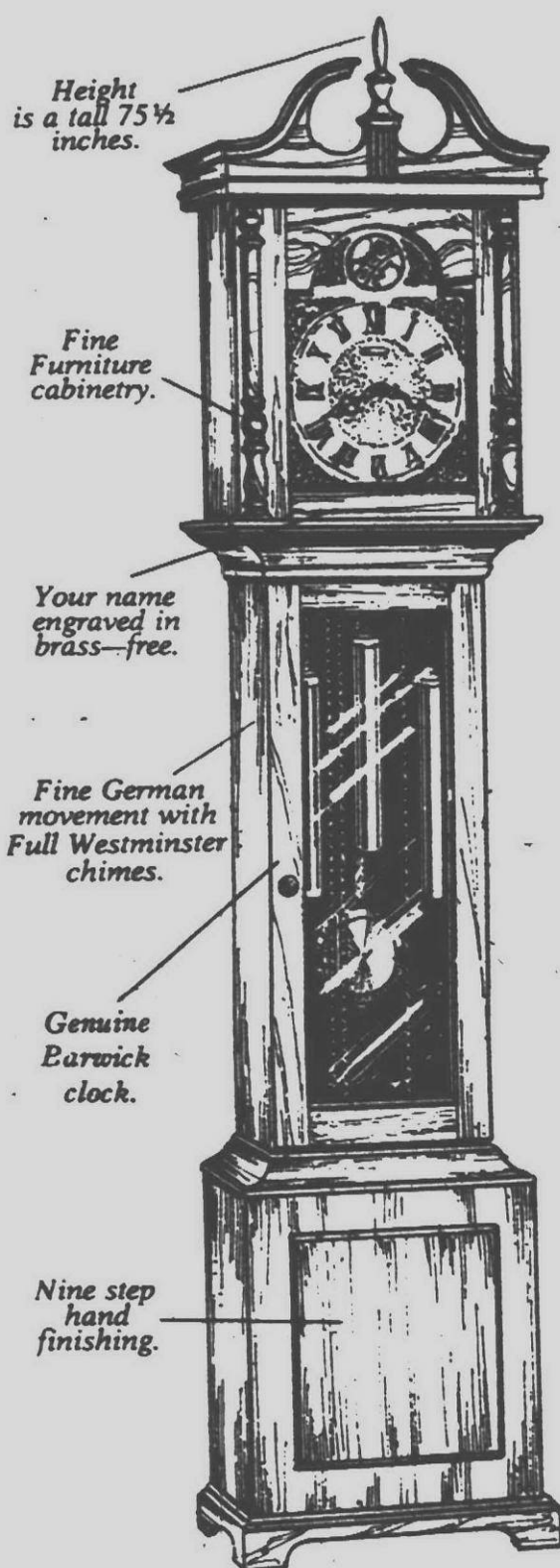

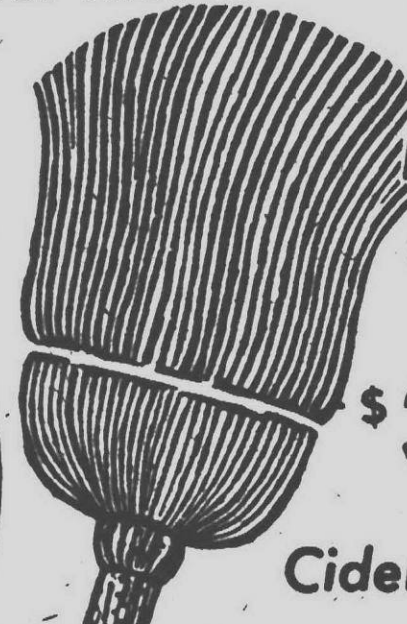

# Wind and sun could replace traditional energy sources, pair say

Despite the fact that he was speaking at a Futures Week seminar at Schoolcraft College, Richard MacMath of Sun Structures in Ann Arbor turned to the past to explain why people burn fuel for energy rather than rely on natural fuel sources such as wind and sun.

"Man found his first source of fuel when he set fire to wood," he explained. "Since then he has also burned gas, oil and coal. The idea of not burning anything or not using up energy is a concept that never entered his head."

"Yet in three days more solar energy strikes the earth than there is in all the fossil fuel ever consumed."

BUT HE is hopeful about the future because ideas about alternate sources of energy are now being considered by many.

One of the many is Jim Easterly, who joined MacMath during Futures Week in support of wind and sun. He is employed by Environmental Energies, Inc., a Detroit organization which aims to teach man to live in balance with his environment.

Easterly explained that he had once been committed to the nuclear energy field and even worked on nuclear submarines before he decided it was not the job for him.

He found the problem of reducing radioactive wastes "a headache and a messy way to go."

He added: "There is a low yield from nuclear power plants."

Today he and his associates spend their time manufacturing electric components for windmill systems which they have sold to customers in India, Puerto Rico, the Bahamas and western Michigan.

The latter area, he claimed, "is one of the best wind velocity areas in the world."

HE SAID the components cost from \$6,900 to about \$675.

"The more expensive system will include installation of a tower, a generator, batteries and an inverter and will yield about 180 kilowatt hours per month depending on the wind velocity."

"This will provide electricity to power lights, refrigerator, appliances, stereo, TV and a blower for heating. It wouldn't provide enough energy with which to cook, heat water or heat the house."

The lower sum would pay for a 10-foot tower, a control panel, an inverter and batteries.

"With this you could only run lights in a cabin in the woods," he said. "It wouldn't provide much power."

Easterly said he believes in an overall ecological approach to energy.

"Energy consumption is more than plugging into infinite power," he noted. "My company is taking a position of responsibility to the future."

MacGRATH'S FIRM designs and constructs solar heating systems for

homes. It is possible to add solar equipment to the existing house, but he prefers to build from the ground up.

He stressed heavy use of insulation in solar homes. Using slides, he illustrated that a home heated by the sun should be narrow on the north, the direction from which wind usually comes, and wide on the south, where the glass and metal heat collectors are placed.

One house also had a berm raised to protect it on the north from the weather.

Solar heating systems usually store energy from six to eight hours of sunlight in one day in preparation for two or three cloudy days, he said.

## Distress signal proposed

A flat tire in the middle of the night on a deserted highway could mean trouble for any motorist. But if there were some way motorists could contact the police quickly without traveling a great distance, the problem might not have such traumatic implications.

A proposal has been submitted to the Wayne County Public Works Committee that would add an exterior distress signal button to police call boxes along Wayne County freeways. With the distress boxes available every half mile along the freeways, a motorist could use them in the event of an accident, a disabled car, sudden illness or other problem at any time. They could also be used for quick response to prevent traffic tie-ups, further in-

jury and assaults as well as car theft and stripping.

"There are at least 150 police call boxes on Detroit expressways," County Commissioner Clemens Bykowski said, "but they can only be used by an officer with a call box key." At very little cost, an exterior button could be added to the boxes enabling a stranded motorist to communicate directly with an officer at the nearest precinct and relate the problem, he said.

# 'Political reform' law favors incumbents, hacks, favor-sellers

Zolton Ferency, chairman of the radical Human Rights Party. Mary Rave, chairperson of the Michigan Chapter of the ACLU. Eldon Andrews, of the Michigan Conservative Party. Richard Durant, former chairman of the Republican Party's 14th district and conservative activist throughout the GOP statewide. Josephine Chapman, political action chairperson of the George Wallace-leaning American Independent Party. Henry Dodge, legislative director of the Civic, Consumer and Homeowner Association.

A remarkable list, and what's even more remarkable is that there they were yesterday, on the same platform, united in their views.

United on what? you ask.

United in opposition to the recently passed political reform legislation, which their collective press release labeled the "Political Spending Act" or the "Common Cause Rip-Off."

In part, they are sore because the law requires everybody and his uncle to report all political contributions and mandates all officeholders to spread their financial affairs before the public. This they deem an invasion of privacy.

I'M NOT sure that I agree with all their arguments, but I do feel that careful and quietly embedded in the new political reform law are a series of provisions that will, on balance, substantially change for the worse the kinds of people able and willing to get into politics.

The law establishes campaign expenditure ceilings: \$1 million for governor; \$300,000 for secretary of state and attorney General; \$30,000 for state senator; \$15,000 for state representative. These ceilings are, to say the least, adequate; in fact, they are much higher than candidates usually spend in campaigns, even at today's inflated costs.

OK. So how do the candidates get all this money?

Certainly not from citizens who feel concerned about politics and are willing to blow a grand or two on a new, fresh face. The law sets up a maximum limit to contributions for individuals of no more than \$1,700 for all candidates in any year, and restricts an individual's contribution to a given race to \$1,700 for governor, \$450 for state senator and \$250 for state representative.

Something called "independent committees," evidently meaning unions or other associations and lobbies, may contribute up to 10 times the amount for individuals.

WHAT DOES all that mean?

It means that a gubernatorial campaign, to reach its limit, would need 588 individuals each contributing the \$1,700 maximum, or 58.8 lobbies, or a combination of the two. An aspiring state senator would need 66 individuals or 6.6 unions, and a fund-raising state rep would need to hit 60 individuals or 6 unions or lobbies.

So?

So, where are you going to find 60 people to pony up the \$250 limit for a state representative race, unless the candidate is already an incumbent? Ditto state senate races. Ditto governor.

The point is that by allowing a very high campaign expenditure ceiling and enforcing a very low individual contribution limit, the political reform law makes it nearly impossible for fresh, in-

dependent, non-incumbent candidates to raise enough money to make a race against an incumbent.

That's not political reform. That's a law designed to perpetuate incumbents in office.

Which, one suspects, is why it ultimately got passed.

ADD ONE further provision—the political machine dominance mechanism. This provision allows a state central party committee to contribute to a candidate's war chest up to 25 per cent of the limit and allows a county or district party committee to contribute that much more.

That means the official apparatus of the political parties can contribute up to 50 per cent of a candidate's expenditure limit.

And that further insures that the only people who run are those approved by the party hierarchy.

THE ULTIMATE effect of this legislation, unless amended, will be to change quite profoundly the nature of the political process in this state.

It will make entry into the process of fresh, new candidates, unbacked by lobbies or unions or the party hierarchy, nearly impossible. It will so favor incumbents as to reduce political challenges by outsiders to a minimum.

It will do nothing to reduce campaign spending, but simultaneously make it difficult for a fresh face to get enough money to overcome the high visibility of an incumbent or a hack politician who rises from one office to the other, trading on nothing more than his name identification and his ability to trade his office for campaign contributions from favor seekers.

In sum, it will promote exactly the kind of political sociology which gradually, step by step, elevated former suburban politician Spiro T. Agnew to the vice presidency of this country.

The ethics of Agnew were the ethics of a hack politician, and I believe the present bad law will on balance encourage the hacks and their ethics.

I hope the unlikely combination of people protesting the law yesterday, together with the hundreds of thoughtful Republicans and Democrats who are deeply concerned about opening up the process of politics, can get the misnamed political reform act substantially changed.

# Without changes, Detroit could go New York's route

The financial plight of New York City should cause grave concern to anyone who lives in a large metropolitan area.

New York City's problem is simply that costs of services have continually gone up while their revenue base has gone down.

As people desert the core city and flee to the suburbs, Detroit will face the same problem in the near future.

As we have said many times, if the core city goes, can suburbia be far behind? Most people who live in suburbia work in the core city.

New York's problem was heightened by the unwillingness of the mayor to cut expenses when revenues didn't materialize. Detroit isn't in the same situation because, as unpopular as they are, there have been service cuts in Detroit and people have been laid off to keep the losses down. But this is only a short-term solution.

SOUTHEASTERN MICHIGAN lives and dies in proportion to the health of the automobile industry. The automobile industry and its suppliers are the major source of employment and the sales tax generated from the sale of automobiles is a major source of revenue for all municipalities.

To help save Detroit, it has been suggested that the non-resident income tax be doubled. At present a person who works in Detroit but lives outside the city pays a 0.5 per cent flat-rate income tax. The proposal in Lansing is to increase this to one per cent.

Historically, the imposition of the city income tax was one of the major causes of Detroit's downfall.

SERVICE INDUSTRIES found that it didn't matter where their headquarters were. They moved out of the city, north of Eight Mile Road and west of Telegraph, and continued to serve their Detroit city accounts without paying the income tax. To increase the non-resident income tax will mean only that more service companies will abandon the core city and head for the suburbs.

One merely has to drive along Eight Mile Road in Southfield to realize the tremendous growth of that city in office buildings and shopping center complexes which started within months after Detroit passed its initial city income tax.

Without new revenue, Detroit cannot provide the services necessary to keep a large city going.

THERE ARE solutions.

First, because the metropolitan area is really one unit, although it is broken down into many municipalities and at least three counties, perhaps Detroit should enter into metropolitan government.

There are many petty potentates holding public office who will fight this idea because their spheres of influence would be lessened, but a metropolitan government, with taxing authority throughout the metropolitan area, would not create artificial reasons for people moving out of the core city.

SECONDLY, Detroit, to survive, must seek a new type of industry because the automobile industry is too cyclical and it is impossible to finance consistent service on inconsistent income.

The new industry must have different cyclical variations from those of the automotive industry. A wild idea would be to legalize gambling in the State of Michigan.

I have just returned from Las Vegas, which is an inland city created out of desert sand. It has thousands of hotel rooms and thousands of tourists flocking in every day, and it hasn't suffered from the recession.

The casino industry hires thousands of unskilled people as bellhops, hotel maintenance people, security guards and hotel domestics.

GAMBLING IS NOT a moral question, since we have already legalized the state lotteries, bingo and betting at race tracks.

To survive, Detroit has to solve some major internal problems which cause people to move out of the core city. But other cities have solved these problems, and Detroit can if it has the desire.

Suburbia can't live without a healthy core city. The core city can be saved if people are willing to work at it. Its problem, like New York's, has to be a concern of all who live in the metropolitan Detroit area.

# Improve odds of survival



"I had been swimming one very hot afternoon," goes the case of a diabetic. "The heat and too much exercise brought on an insulin reaction."

There, Medic Alert personnel can provide a collect caller other vital information to save a member's life.





The Child Research Center League has a somewhat different money-raising plan this year. Instead of cards, it is selling packets of seals with the symbol of the Child Research Center of Michigan.

Organizations also use the cards to spread information about their group and its purpose.

Kathleen Ott of Plymouth, writing

on behalf of the Spinal Bifida Association of Michigan, said, "Spinal bifida is unheard of for the majority of the population, yet is one of our major birth defects."

She added that the disease, also known as open spine, is caused by a malformation of the central nervous system, resulting in weakness or even total paralysis of the legs, diminished skin sensation and bowel and bladder impairment, and pointed out that money from Christmas cards sold helps the organization support spinal bifida children and their families on emotional, physical and social levels.

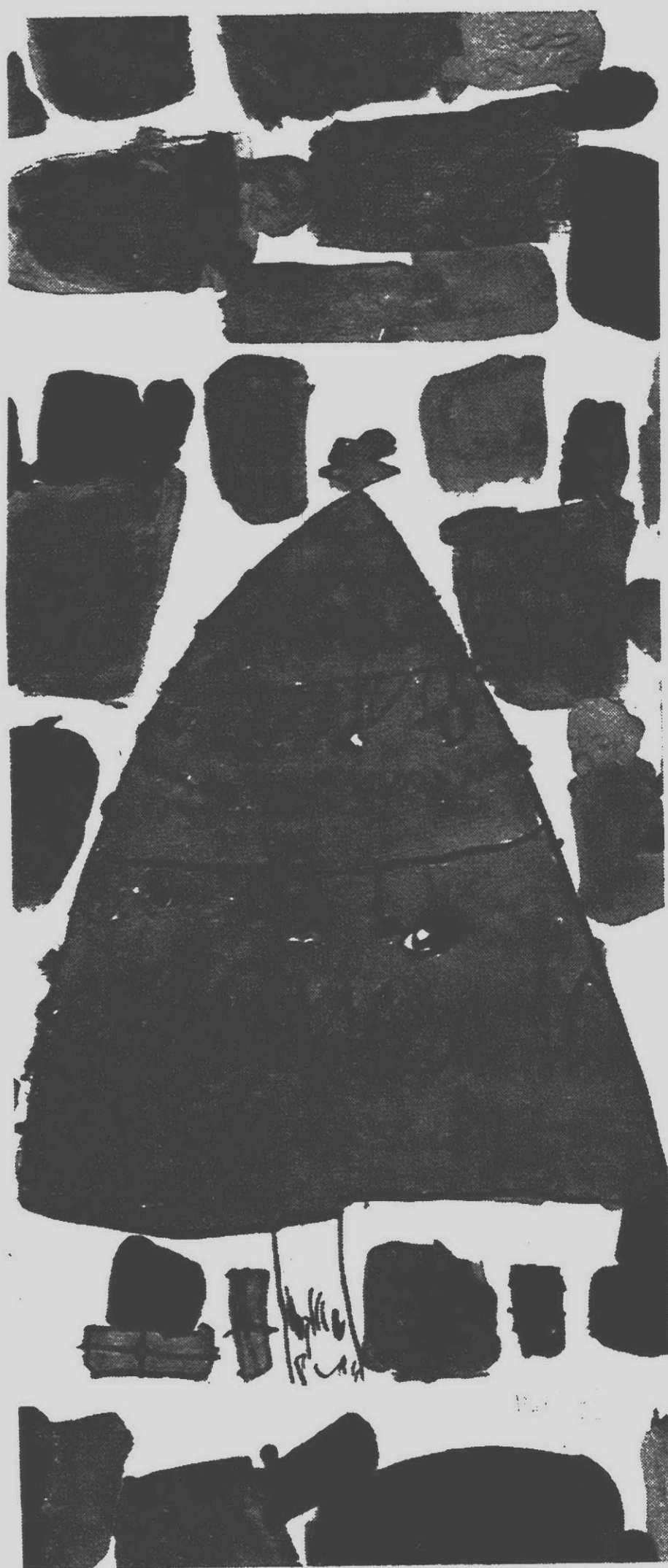

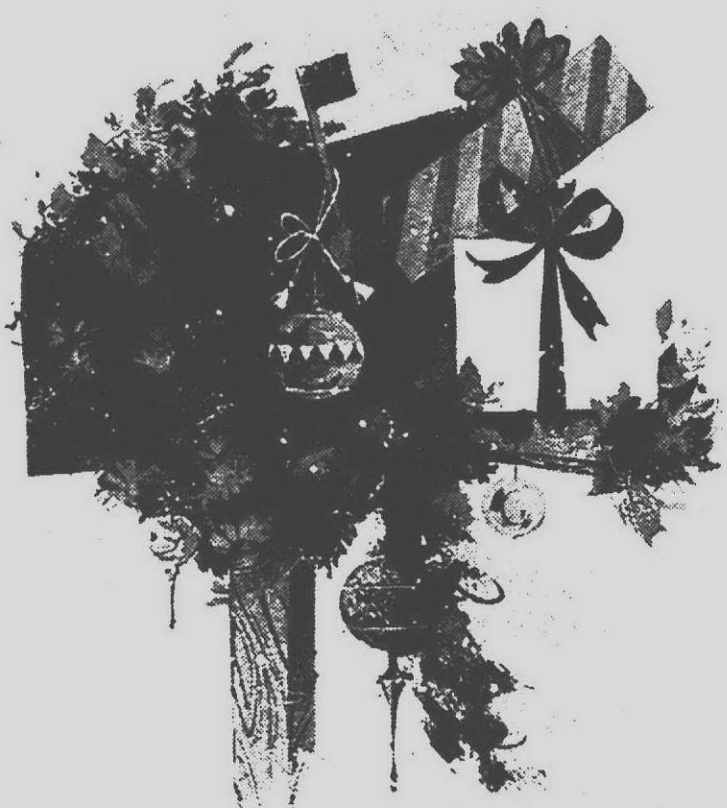

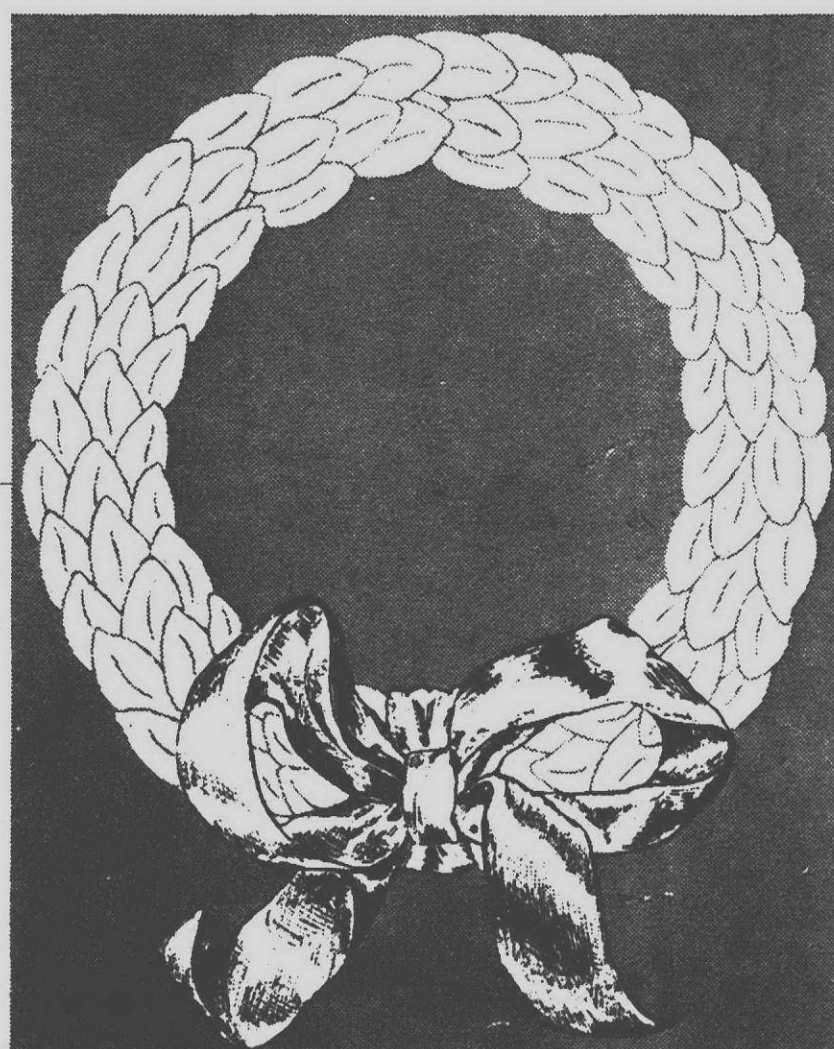

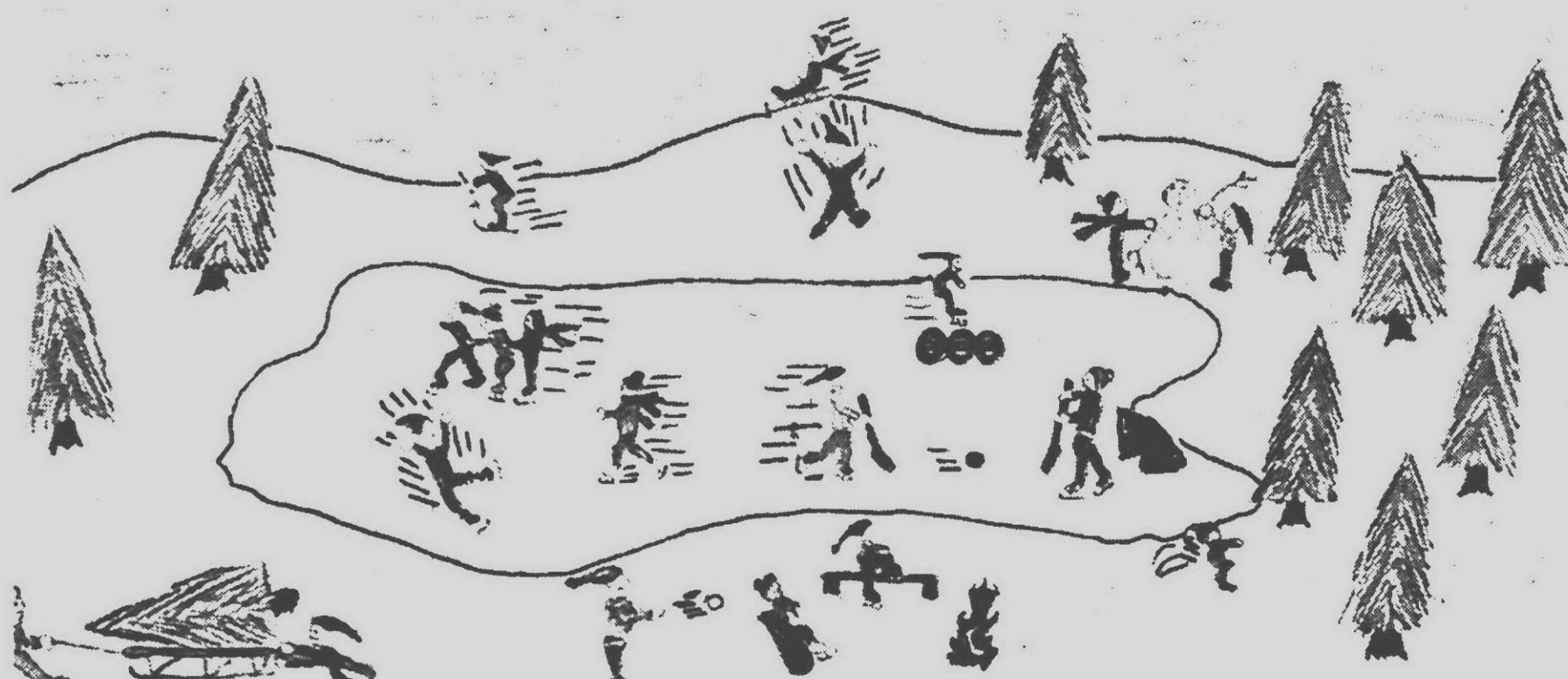

## She's the top gymn teacher

Diane Corbett, who qualified for school administration work but went back to teaching because she missed working with the kids, is Michigan's "Outstanding Physical Educator of 1975."

Ms. Corbett, a member of the Franklin High School faculty for seven years, received a plaque denoting the coveted award last week when the Michigan Association for Health, Education and Recreation held its convention in Troy.

And on hand when she was honored was Lori Pimlott, the Franklin High student who months ago decided this teacher was someone special and thought everyone should know about her.

"LORI'S NOT ON ANY of the teams I coach," said Ms. Corbett. "She's just a good student who seemed to enjoy the classes and did well." Lori, for her part, said she'd worked with a lot of teachers and considered Ms. Corbett "really good—one of the best."

Because Lori is thinking some of going into physical education as a career, she knew about the American Alliance for Health, Education and Recreation and wrote to that organization in Washington.

"They forwarded my letter to the Michigan association," she said, and a few weeks ago Lori, Ms. Corbett and others at Franklin learned of the selection.

It is quite unusual for a student to make the nomination for this top award, Ms. Corbett said. Usually the school administrators do the honors.

WHAT MAKES this teacher outstanding in this student's eyes?

"Dedication," Lori said quickly. "She always would tell us it's not how well we do but how hard we try."

Ms. Corbett insisted "I just teach the class, and try to make them enjoy it while learning something."

"They have enough trouble with rough academic courses," she added. "I try to help them have a little fun in their lives."

That she too enjoys the classes she heads is evident from the fact that, after earning an educational specialist degree at Wayne State University she was promoted to administration work, but lasted only a few months outside the gym.

"I had thought that was what I wanted," she said, "but I missed teaching and asked to go back."

Ms. Corbett said she felt physical education classes in general go very well at Franklin "and it's because the staff is especially close."

"We all get along well and work well together," she added.

# Islamic Center helps teens visit Mideast

The best way for a young person to travel to exotic lands these days is through an educational or religious program.

For Livonian Dina Mansour, it was

a combination of both. She was able to wander through fascinating centers of culture in the Mideast through the help of the Islamic Center of Detroit, where she teaches Sunday school.

The program with which she was involved was educational, sponsored by

the Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs in Egypt.

In a school in Alexandria, Egypt, she studied the Arabic language as well as the Islamic religion. She also listened to political leaders, and had time left over for sight-seeing.

THE TRIP WAS an adventure from the very beginning.

"Most of the students who flew over traveled together," said Dina, whose father, Tahir Mansour, also was on the plane as an advisor to the group and to take care of business affairs in the Mideast.

"There was a bomb threat in regard to the plane so we were kept in Germany for six hours. This caused us to miss our connecting flight. So we had to stay in Beirut, Lebanon for two days.

"They put us up in a hotel and we went to see some beautiful caves.

"There were no other tourists in the hotel because of civil disturbances in the city. It seemed like a ghost town. The 27 people in our group were the only ones in a hotel with 11 floors.

"But nothing happened to us, although the soldiers at the airport forbade us to take pictures. They were afraid someone might see the flash and shoot."

BECAUSE of the delay, no one was waiting for the group when it flew into Cairo.

"We had to wait six hours to get a bus to come down from Alexandria to take us to the school," said Dina, a senior at Churchill High School. "We got there at 2:30 a.m., and had to be up at 7 a.m. for classes."

But then came the fun part.

"At first we thought we would have problems in communication," noted Dina. "But we had a great time. We picked out people who knew a little English and talked to them. The second night we had a talent show.

"We taught the whole school to sing 'Power to the People.' Most of them didn't know what they were singing, but it caught on."

ALEXANDRIA is a beautiful city,

according to the Livonia teenager. Most every building is made of stone and looks white. The temperature was not too hot and was cool at night.

"We went sightseeing every day, visiting beaches and the Roman ruins," she said. "We saw King Farouk's palace. It was fantastic, with beautiful wall hangings. It's now a museum.

"We visited the Al Abbas mosque. The American group was awestruck. The walls of the whole place are inlaid with mother-of-pearl, copper, silver and turquoise mosaics. We had to take off our shoes to go in."

Women's lib has caused few ripples in the area according to Dina. "Women are placed on a pedestal," she stated. "They have large families, and they seem content to stay home and take care of them. They certainly don't resent it. They have a good time.

"They follow the Muslim rule of covering up. We followed this tradition and didn't wear sleeveless shirts, shorts or short skirts."

IT IS NECESSARY to take a test to

go to high school, but girls are equal as far as education goes, she pointed out.

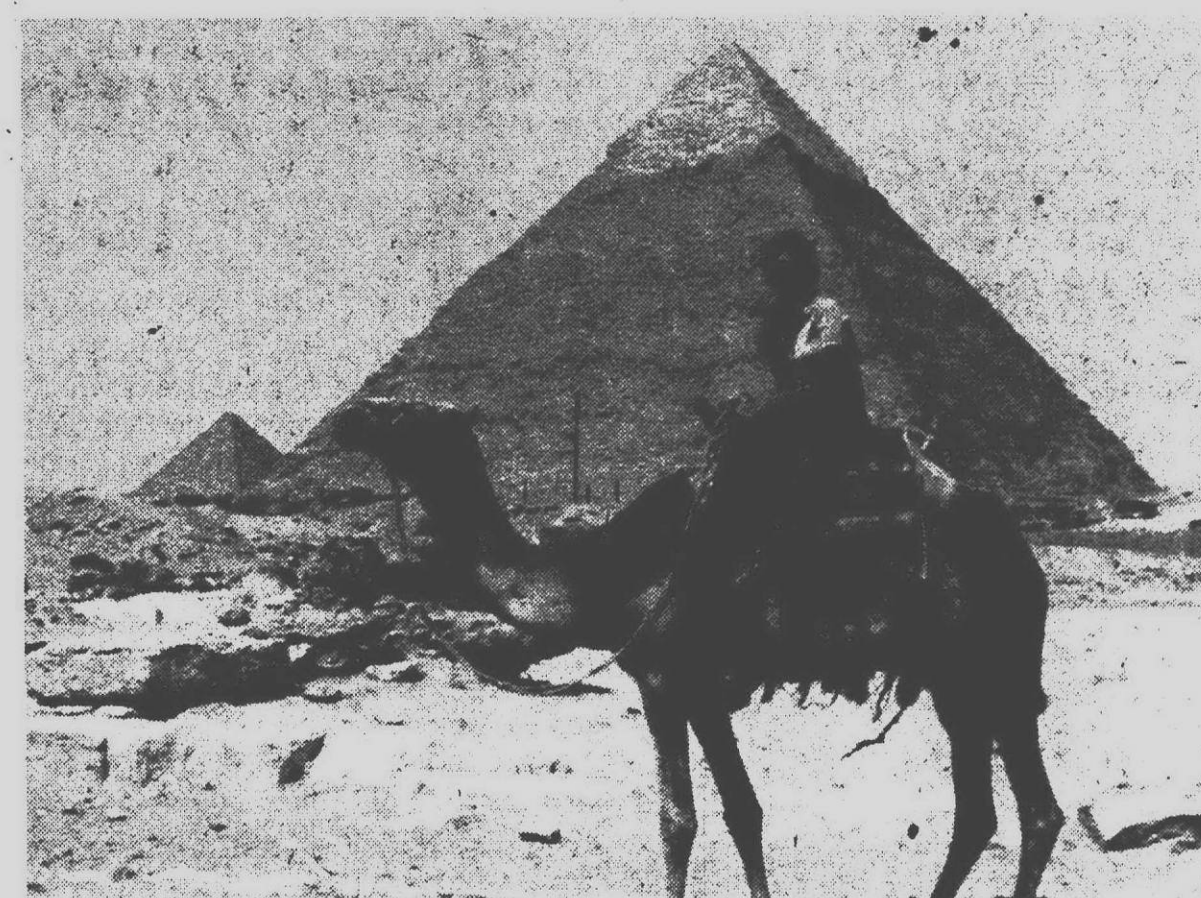
"The girls and guys are smart as whips," she declared. "They learn English in grades 10-12, and speak pretty well. At school, boys outnumber the girls. But I met two girls going into political science and another going into theater."

Even while talking to many people and taking classes, Dina did not miss out on the traditional thing to do when in Egypt.

"I went with a friend to her grandfather's house in Cairo," she said. "We saw the pyramids and the Nile River, and I rode on a camel. It's bumpy, and I felt awfully high off the ground."

BUT WHAT TURNED on Dina the most was the welcome she received from her relatives in Jordan.

"That was the best part of the trip," she smiled. "I met all my aunts and uncles and loads of cousins. I was really impressed with them."

# Jobless scene leads to service project

A group of men at Aldersgate United Methodist Church in Redford Township have looked closely at today's unemployment scene and found a fitting way to give Christian service.

They are serving as lay counselors to help out-of-work people deal with the trauma such a situation presents and find ways to improve their lives.

These men, explained the Rev. William G. Wager, pastor of the church located at 10000 Beech Daly, brought their suggestion for a new kind of church service forward several months ago.

"We knew of people, in our church and out of it," the minister said, "who had found that losing a job was a terrible experience."

"These men, some of whom had been through the experience and understood better than anyone, wanted to see if they could help."

SO THE GROUP, chaired by Melvin Turner, began study and training ses-

## Immanuel church marks 110 years

Immanuel Lutheran Church, 27035 Ann Arbor Trail, Dearborn Heights, will mark its 110th anniversary with a special service and a buffet dinner Sunday, Oct. 26.

sions to improve their understanding of the problem involved and the way people react to it.

Rev. Wager said the group's purpose is "to deal with the emotional problems involved, rather than to act as an employment agency."

John Dutton, a retiree who describes himself as "a sucker for self-improvement all my life," is co-chairman of the project.

"The basic problem is that one's personhood is closely tied to the work he does," Dutton explained. "He sees his value as a person reflected in his job classification, where he works and the pay he receives."

"When these are taken away, he becomes a 'non-person.' He feels shame, guilt and panic. Along with these there may be seething rage and resentment against the individuals who may have been involved. He may find himself ringed in by fear, frustration and desperation."

Dutton added that efforts at job-hunting can just increase the problem, because each "no" takes away more pride and "his self-image takes a nosedive."

THE ALDERSGATE GROUP, Dutton said, is seeking to help in three ways.

"One is to help the person out of work to get himself together," he explained. "Then we want to bring

human caring and spiritual resources to bear on the problem. And finally, we want to provide an affirming atmosphere in which the man out of work can feel he is not alone."

Dutton cited the case of one man who had been out of work for two years because of a back injury.

"In talking to him," he said, "we realized that the thing that interested him most was antique cars, so we zeroed in on that."

"Looking around in that field, entirely different from the one he had been in, he received an offer for a job at a salary that seemed a little low."

"Then, before he could even start, he had another offer for a job with higher pay, but he had given his word to the first prospective employer so he did not go back on it."

"He has since received a raise and is now more satisfied with his work than ever before."

DUTTON SAID anyone in the community is welcome to seek the assistance of the church group, and emphasized that any conversation with any of its members will be kept completely confidential.

The first contact should be with the pastor at the church, he added.

# 'Personals' deserves second look

Few shows deserve a second look, but "Personals" at the Dinner Theatre of Detroit in Mercy College promised significant change from its laborious opening in January.

From the entree to coffee and curtain call, "Personals" has been remolded into a compact and altogether pleasing evening. A choice of two main dishes and table service have replaced the buffet, while the original 25 songs and endless visuals have been cut to a manageable length.

Cutting went so far as to leave the sparkling Mary Ann Paquette without a solo, but "Altoona Waltz" was restored to the program for her.

Gone completely is Barbara Bredius, replaced by Barbara Barrow, wife of composer-conductor Michael Peter Smith.

REMAINING ARE 20 neatly crafted songs, a pitch for Sly's Cureall and Benjamin Franklin, all connected in sometimes tenuous fashion to a progression of personal ads from newspapers old and not-so-old.

The narrated ads still tend to drag out the show, but at least a semblance of order and connection now exists between the visual and vocal material.

A variety of style now distinguishes the songs, which were formerly punched out indiscriminately in country-western or rhythm-blues style. Most notable is Phil Esser's rendition of "Young Men Who Speak of the Heart," reminiscent of the worst of both Andy Williams and Johnny Mathis.

Less successful is the rereading of "Gypsy Lover" in mock supernatural,

complete with blacklight, weird make-up and meaningless movement, not an advisable first-act finale.

STILL, "PERSONALS" has become much better entertainment with Esser's economical, even austere direction, and the rich textures of John Loviska's lighting and Susan Esser's costumes.

The revision also gives Michael Peter Smith the opening spot for the show, in which he tailors the time to suit the timelessness of the coming couple of hours.

From beginning to end, and for most of the middle, "Personals" is now a far better show, with a promise of even more in the future.

The curtain call slot is used for trying out new numbers, the latest proposal being the absurdly funny "I Married A Spade," sung by Ms. Paquette to the redoubtable Charlie Latimer.

The dinner and the show still feel like a dollar too much; nevertheless, "Personals" at Mercy College remains one of the best package deals in town.

## EMU adds music therapy

An interdisciplinary program leading to a bachelor's degree in music therapy was approved recently by the Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents.

"Music therapy," a proposal for the program explains, "is the use of

music and music-related activities as prescribed and supervised by qualified personnel to assist a patient in achieving a therapeutic goal."

Administered through the music department, the program will require 12 semester hours of music therapy

courses and will include classes in music, health, physical education and recreation, sociology and anthropology and psychology and special education.

Music therapists, the proposal states, are employed in a variety of medical, educational and social services agencies.

New courses include "Psychology of Music," a course studying learning theories and their application to music. Another, "Influence of Music on Behavior," examines the physiological and psychological effects of music.

"Music in Therapy" is a new course examining the practice and technique of music therapy in the treatment of children and adults in areas of mental and/or physical impairments, behavior disorders and geriatrics. An advanced course includes observation and visitation in clinical settings.

During the senior year, the degree candidate will spend six months of clinical training in a psychiatric hospital affiliated with the National Association for Music Therapy.

The program includes an optional fifth year of study leading to teacher certification in elementary and secondary music.

## Spartans fall, 7-0 Rice nips Borgess

Bishop Borgess has a very good football team.

Just ask number one ranked Birmingham Brother Rice—and its coaches—and the estimated 4,000 chilled fans who saw the Spartans actually outplay the Warriors before a last-period touchdown gave the visitors a 7-0 victory.

"I'm as proud of these kids as I can be," exclaimed Borgess head coach Fred Mushinski after the bruising defensive struggle ended. "Most people didn't give us much of a chance, but Brother Rice knows we've got a pretty good football team and I feel we could just as easily have won the game as not."

The game was scoreless for three quarters as both defensive units hit with great ferocity. Brother Rice and Borgess each recovered three fumbles jarred loose by the hard-hitting tacklers, while the Warriors picked off two Keith Studzinski passes.

Borgess, whose stout defense held Brother Rice to 179 total net yards, had 10 first downs to only seven for Brother Rice and gained 197 net yards.

However, it was one defensive surge by the Warriors that determined the outcome of the classic struggle for first place in the Central Division of the Detroit Catholic League and gave Brother Rice its 20th consecutive win.

That key series of downs came about four minutes into the final quarter. After Borgess took a punt on its 22 yardline, Rice rose up and threw the Spartans for a four-yard loss. Then quarterback Studzinski dropped back to pass on the next two downs

and was nailed by the hard-charging Warrior defense both times.

Leading the fired-up visitors were linebackers K.C. Ryan and Dan MacLean, tackles Steve Feller and Jay McGlinchey and nose guard Steve Arkwright. They nailed Studzinski on the three. On fourth down, Jim Kozlowski, who gained 55 yards in 20 carries, lofted a 38-yard punt which Joe Fontanesi returned to the Borgess 26.

Three running plays moved to a first down on the Spartan 15 and another run picked up two. Then Warrior quarterback Don Hendricks, who completed three of five passes for 34 yards, faked a handoff, dropped back and hit tight end Terry Simmons who slid quietly into the right part of the endzone.

Bishop Borgess had nine of its 11 players going both ways while only two of Rice's team saw double duty. Singled out for special praise by the coaching staff were defensive stalwarts Joe Dudzinski, a linebacker who played a whale of a game; defensive tackles John Wedesky and Mike Ostach and injured defensive end Kevin McKee who played well despite his ailment.

Safety Jim Kozlowski was also given a hearty pat on the back for his outstanding defensive work, as well as punting and trying to dent the big Rice defense.

The Spartans had two deep penetrations. The first carried to the Rice 19 yardline in the first quarter and the second moved to the Warrior 17 when a pass interception ended the threat with 30 seconds left in the game.

On its first period march, Borgess quarterback Studzinski was injured

slightly when tackled and sophomore Steve Michuta took over the controls and moved the Spartans methodically down the field to the 19 yardline. On first-and-10, a fumble was grabbed by Rice.

Studzinski, who completed eight of 15 passes for 134 yards while Michuta had two-for-two for 32 yards, moved Borgess on their long last period march after Rice had scored.

The poised senior, who also plays defensive halfback, took the Spartans from their own nine-yard line all the way down to the Warriors' 17, where defensive halfback Pat Callaghan pilfered the pigskin.

The loss drops Borgess to a 3-2-1 overall mark and 3-1 in the league while Brother Rice is 6-0 (five of them shutouts) and 4-0 in the Central League with DeLaSalle left to play in the regular season.

Assistant Borgess coach Gene Grewe echoed head coach Fred Mushinski's high praise for the kids.

"I have nothing but the highest feeling for the performance our boys gave out there," Grewe said. "When they came dragging off the field after the game, nine of them going both ways, they were a tired group of athletes. They gave all they had and are a tremendous group of kids."

"In our eyes, they're just as good as Brother Rice was Sunday."

Grewe made special mention of a mistake in the schedule. "Borgess plays at 7:30 p.m. this Saturday night at Livonia Bentley High School against Notre Dame High School," he stressed, "and Notre Dame has beaten U-D, Catholic Central and DeLaSalle and is the only team to score on Brother Rice in six games this year."

Just as it is wrong to cry long over spilled milk, it is also a pity to spend too much time contemplating the future.

There are those who spend so much time preparing for the future, that they completely lose sight of today and its joys. It is possible to save so much for a rainy day that one never enjoys the sunshine.

WHEN I was a small child, I once heard a preacher who believed the world was coming to an end. He said that he had been given a revelation that it would happen in just 30 days. He was very convincing, and I, for one, believed him and was terrified.

I went home and told my mother. "Mama," I said, "the world is coming to an end in 30 days."

My mother replied, "Oh, is that so?" and kept right on with what she was doing.
