

Plymouth Township fails to enact hunting ban

Plymouth Township's hunting regulations are still unsolved in spite of a heavy discussion which lasted nearly an hour and a half at Tuesday's board meeting.

A "final recommendation" presented to the board by a three-man Hunting Area Control Committee failed to meet approval of the board and left a group of residents unhappy.

Pleas from several residents and the suggestion from Trustee Richard Gornick that hunting be banished entirely within the township were voted down.

The recommendation, presented to the board by Joseph H. West, town-

ship treasurer and a member of the committee, suggested "Hunting with or the discharge of a firearm is unlawful in that portion of Plymouth Township, Wayne County, lying east of Beck Road, except in Section 21 and the north half of Section 28, T1S, R8E" or west of Burke to Napier.

"Hunting with or the discharge of any firearm other than a shotgun loaded with shot not larger than No. 2 is unlawful in Plymouth Township, except on target ranges recognized and approved by the township board," Gornick said such a law would be hard to enforce and added:

"It would be better to do away with hunting in the township completely.

"This will happen eventually as the area grows so I think that banishing hunting entirely now is the only answer."

Several residents supported this opinion. Some of them cited instances in which hunters were unlawfully on their property making it a potentially dangerous situation.

Janet Campbell of Ann Arbor Trail said: "I beg you to reconsider the ordinance. A no hunting law will solve our problems."

Mrs. Campbell said she had seen hunters near the barn on her property, that no hunting signs she had posted were torn down.

"Putting a fence around the proper-

ty just doesn't work," she added.

"The hunters simply climb over." Mrs. Debra Evans of Ridge Road said she has had hunters "10 feet off our road. They refuse to leave and I've tried to get the state police to do something about it but to no avail," she said.

Another resident of the area said a man had shot a pheasant on her property and she refused to let him retrieve it.

"Most hunters have no respect for anything but a no hunting sign."

Clerk Helen Richardson said she objected to the committee's recommendation because it reopens an area that is closed. Mrs. Richardson, West, Su-

pervisor J. D. McLaren, and Trustee Frank Millington, voted down a motion by Trustee Gerald Burke that the township "restrict all discharge of firearms in the township with the exception of the gun club which would be allowed to use guns for target practice.

Millington, who said he was not a hunter, agreed with West that there are persons who like to hunt on their own property and that it would not be right to ban hunting entirely.

It was agreed by board members that any rule would be hard to enforce because the township lacks its own police force.

In discussing the size of shot to be permitted, a No. 2, several residents said a person would still be seriously injured if hit by one.

It was also questioned as to how would the size of the shot be patrolled.

West remarked, "Is it easier to enforce no hunting than the size of the shot? I don't think so."

Several residents left the meeting in disgust when they saw there was not going to be any progress in controlling hunting or the use of firearms.

The session ended with the board agreeing 4-3 to ask the committee for an amended recommendation.

Contracts for subs is battled by board

A difficult decision was made by the Plymouth Board of Education Monday night when it voted 4-3 to begin offering permanent contracts to 10 persons who started teaching this fall as permanent substitutes.

The 10 were "hired" as permanent substitutes because the district earlier in year was unsure what its student count would be and, therefore, unsure about how many teachers must be hired to maintain student-teacher ratios.

The \$102,000 cost of offering contracts to the 10 had been included in the budget adopted Monday night. The motion to offer contracts was passed before the vote taken to adopt the budget.

If the vote had been against offering contracts to the 10, the budget might have been adopted with a fund balance of \$185,500.

THE CRUX of the arguments was that the district is facing another cut-back in state aid and would have to further reduce the operating budget.

Those against offering contracts argued it was wrong to offer contracts one week and lay off persons a couple weeks later. Voting against offering contracts to the 10 permanent subs were trustees Gary Mirto, Joseph Gray and George Lawton.

MARCIA BOROWSKI made the motion to authorize Norman Kee, assistant superintendent for personnel, to

begin offering contracts to the 10 permanent substitutes and to come back to the board for approval of each individual hire.

"This is one area we looked at in budget sessions for reduction," complained Gray. "We discussed starting a study on use of librarians and reading teachers and looking for a different type of program."

"We might have more cuts to make yet. I'd like to see the study started because our big budget numbers are in people."

Lawton reminded the board that the district is facing a state aid cut of at least another \$60,000 and most likely more. "Until I see the dollar figures we are going to lose, I'm not prepared to vote on this type of commitment."

"I agree we are facing more cuts and it's scary," countered Borowski. "But, at the same time, there are two groups of people we must be fair to and honest with, and they are the students and teachers."

"There are students in the classrooms being taught by permanent substitutes who have a right to a permanent teacher. And we must be fair to these teachers who are working on a day-to-day basis who we do indeed want to show up for work tomorrow."

"If we must lay off in the future, we are still allowed to do this. But right now we don't have any ridiculous low figures for class size—these 10 teachers are needed to maintain class ratios."

DR. E.J. MCLENDON, trustee, pointed out that the budget did include the money to offer contracts to the ten permanent subs.

"These are difficult days. But there is no effective way we can maintain teacher morale and still ask these teachers to continue working on a day-to-day basis."

"It is teachers and the classroom that is the first ingredient of carrying on a school program."

Mirto argued that the morale of other teachers wasn't at stake but only the morale of the 10 permanent subs. "If we don't offer contracts now they will continue teaching, because of the job market, and will expect full positions when the board decides it can add to staff."

Yack said he agreed with Borowski that the only rationale for offering the contracts was for the welfare of students and staff.

Supt. John M. Hoben said the budget did include contracts for the 10 but that layoffs may be in the district's future.

The administration has been asked by the board to find another \$246,000 (two per cent) in the budget which can be trimmed with the impending loss in state aid facing the district, Hoben added. "This additional cut might require some type of staff cuts."

"The governor's decision on state aid reduction will be out in a couple of weeks," commented Gray. "I don't

Tricks come too early for pumpkin dealer

Plymouth resident Ginger Scott will be glad when Halloween is over.

The sight of smashed orange pumpkins and gooey, white seeds has greeted the 48-year-old resident of 710 N. Mill every morning for the past three weeks.

Apparently the work of teenage pranksters, the smashed pumpkins represent the loss of desperately needed cash for Mrs. Scott and her two sons, who need the pumpkin money to pay off this month's rent.

"I thought I had a chance to sell pumpkins and put some milk and bread on the table," confided Mrs. Scott, as she sat in the bright October sun awaiting the arrival of customers. "When I lose a pumpkin, I don't just lose what I paid for it. I lose what I could have got."

DESCRIBING herself as an odds-and-ends salesperson who does what she can to make ends meet, Mrs.

Scott manages to support herself and two sons, despite a severe allergy problem which cancels her ability to hold a paying job.

Licensed to care for elderly persons, Mrs. Scott cooks and sews for a 73-year-old man and conducts odds-and-ends sales in her frontyard at Liberty and Mill. Income from her teenage son's job helps cover expenses.

But Mrs. Scott, who admits she could qualify for government assistance, wants no part of welfare.

"I want to take care of myself. My kids may go to school with a patched shirt on, but at least I bought it myself. If the only thing I leave them is the making of an honest day's work, then I've left them a treasure."

Mrs. Scott cannot understand the motives of pumpkin-smashing kids, many of whom, she says, are nearing their 20s.

"Why do these kids do it? Are their kicks as small as that? I just want to

be left alone and sell my pumpkins."

TEENAGERS smashed \$200 worth of pumpkins as of Monday afternoon.

Police promised her a nightly patrol around the pumpkin crop until Halloween is over. Mrs. Scott Monday pledged a nightly vigilance in front of her home to guard the pumpkins and potential cash.

"As bad as I need this money, I'd give them to someone who was hungry. But just to pick up my pumpkins and smash them—I just can't believe it."

"I love this little town, and I want to stay here," said Mrs. Scott, who has lived in Plymouth for three years. "But, geez, is everyone so wealthy they have no concern for their neighbor?"

"I try to support myself. I don't want to go on welfare. I could support myself if people would only keep their kids home."

Resident critically injured in Salem airplane crash

Jack A. Marr, who was injured in a two-plane collision at Salem airport Sunday, was reported still in critical condition Wednesday morning at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor.

Mrs. Marr, from her home at 9105 S. Main, Plymouth, said her husband was still in intensive care but that "The doctors give us every hope of his recovery."

Marr, 53, was a passenger in the airplane piloted by Arthur Rogers, 52, of 29106 Sunnydale, Livonia. Also seriously injured was Rogers' daughter, Beverly, 21, who is in the Ann Arbor Hospital.

Rogers and the pilot of the second aircraft, David March, 31, of Por-

tsmouth, Ohio, were killed instantly in the crash which occurred about 3:35 p.m. as both pilots were apparently attempting to land at the same time.

Marr, who is Rogers' brother-in-law, suffered cuts and burns.

Although eyewitnesses give different view of the collision. Police believe both planes were heading south toward the airport with the intention of landing.

It is believed that Rogers' Cessna, being a high wing plane and March's plane a low-wing Piper, made it impossible for the pilots to see each other making the approach to the landing strip.

Witnesses said the planes collided about 300 feet above the runway and

fell immediately to the ground, bursting into flames. Both pilots were burned almost beyond recognition.

Salem airport, located off Six Mile Road, west of Northville has no radio control tower.

Marr had worked at Johnson Stamping in Plymouth about two years prior to being laid off last May. He was a fellow employee of Rogers' who had been plant manager at the plant where he worked for about 25 years.

Northville Township police, along with Michigan State Police troopers who responded to the accident, said the planes landed in a swampy area north of the airport and that there was "Nothing but smoke and flames" when they arrived at the site.

Concerned Students ask for calm study of CEP

The newly-organized group which calls itself Concerned Students appealed to the Plymouth Board of Education Monday night not to scrap modular scheduling in its entirety.

The students ask for a calming of emotions, a carefully study, and then a determination of what improvements could be made.

Kevin Snoeberger, student, said he felt the system was working well. "There are problems but abolishing modular scheduling would be drastic. It would be better to modify than abolish."

THREE-FOURTHS of the students at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) use their unstructured time constructively, he added.

"There has been a lot of talk about the use of drugs and alcohol, sex and vandalism at the Park. Well, there would be a drug problem under traditional scheduling. It only takes a moment to push a needle, and just a second to pop a pill."

"If somebody wants to take drugs, they will. It has little, if nothing, to do with modular scheduling. There's very little drinking going on out at the CEP."

"Not everybody makes good use of their time. But doing nothing in the commons area is no worse than sleeping in class or being bored in class."

"Some revisions can be made. But I don't think traditional scheduling will solve all our problems."

"Things would work better if we could discuss this issue calmly instead of going off half-cocked and making accusations without knowledge. Parents should come and tour the CEP and learn more about it before attacking the system."

KEVIN SNOEBERGER of Concerned Students commented that suggestions that open sexual relations occur at the CEP is an example of over-reaction.

He said Concerned Students were planning to meet today (Thursday) at 2:20 p.m. in the little theater in Plymouth Canton High and invited board members and interested persons to attend.

Trustee Marcia Borowski commented that volunteers taking surveys around for Concerned Parents should be very clear in identifying themselves and state they are doing the survey because some residents had received the impression the school district was conducting the survey.

MRS. FRANKIE JOHNSON of Concerned Parents said that the parents in her group in no way ever indicated that the CEP was Sin City.

"Channel 4 took an innocent remark made by Principal Bill Brown that 'this isn't Sin City' and blew it up and capitalized on it. But it wasn't our doing."

"We have never tried to attack the schools on drugs or these other matters. We think these problems exist but the extent has been exaggerated by the television media."

"We aren't attacking anything but just want to find out how the residents feel about the educational concept at the CEP."

Priest wants local site to help others with his problem

Younger alcoholics. Alcohol and drugs. More women alcoholics. The job is getting bigger and more complicated for the few agencies working on this personal, family and social problem, says the Rev. Vaughan Quinn, who is eyeing a site in west-

ern Wayne County to expand his work.

Father Quinn is 42, but his body is a dozen years older—and looks it—because of his own bout with alcohol. "I haven't had a drink in 10 years and three or four months," he grinned, his face wrinkling like actor Burgess Meredith's.

QUINN WILL SPEAK to the Plymouth Civitan Club at 6:45 p.m., Nov. 13 in the Mayflower Hotel. The meeting is open to all concerned persons. Dinner is \$4.50 but there is no charge for those who attend only for Quinn's talk.

Quinn is author of a proposal to expand the work of his Sacred Heart Rehabilitation Center, 569 E. Elizabeth in Detroit, to the former site of the Wayne County Child Development Center on Sheldon north of Five Mile Road in Northville Township.

Despite heavy opposition, Quinn's proposal may be accepted by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Not only are his wit and frankness charming, not only is he an old-fashioned character with his three St. Bernard dogs and four antique fire engines, but he is, in the words of one legislator, a "heavyweight" as an administrator.

Northville folks are unhappy with his plan (and others) because of neighborhood problems with state mental hospital walkways, their lack of tax base and a brooding feeling that "Detroit" has used Northville and Plymouth as a dumping ground for such unpopular institutions as a prison, a state mental hospital, a home for the retarded, a center for teen drug addicts and a TB sanatorium that's now a state park.

Schoolcraft College, with Wayne State University, would like to operate a joint program there, and is fighting for priority with the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Despite it all, the betting odds are that Quinn will get it, although the priest himself wonders aloud why

everyone thinks he has it locked up.

"THE AGE OF alcoholics is dropping," he said. "Eight years ago the average age was 46. Now it's 32."

The age drop is more shocking than it sounds at first. "The older ones had a value system. They had a job and a family, and they know what it is to speed and get a ticket."

"Now the young one—28, 25, down to 17—he may have been messed up since he was 14."

"He's never been to a dance or a movie. He's never been on a date or held a job—he's never done anything."

As Quinn sees it, the Sacred Heart program would be expanded to a second phase to cover socialization and

job training. The Northville site figures into that plan. He simply doesn't have room in the Detroit building.

Contrary to some reports, Quinn's program is not aimed at drug addicts but at persons who are primarily alcoholic, drugs being a complicating factor.

Women alcoholics are becoming more numerous—possibly because women today are less afraid to drink, possibly because they are less ashamed to admit it and seek help.

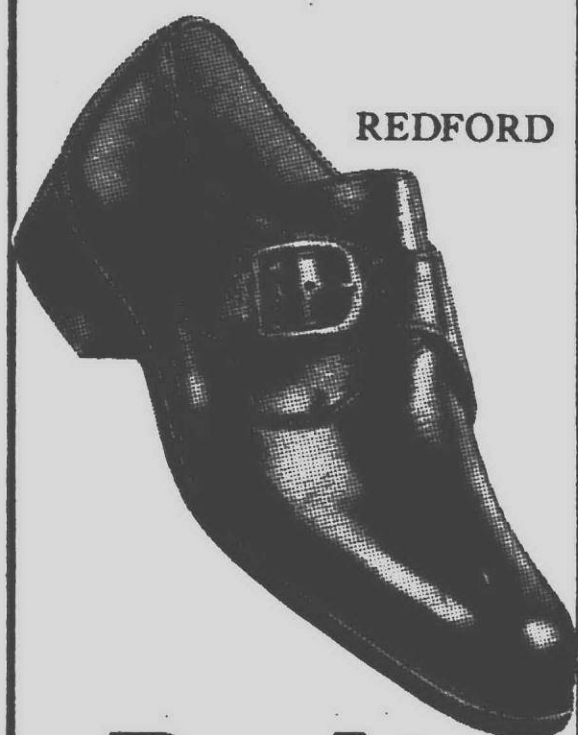
Quinn explains that a state law scheduled to take effect the first of 1977 will decriminalize alcohol—the drunk tank and ragpicker squad will

be things of the past." He visualizes a local program to take care of that part of the problem.

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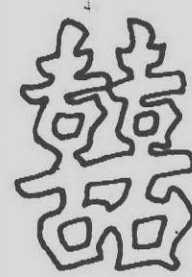
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Price raised

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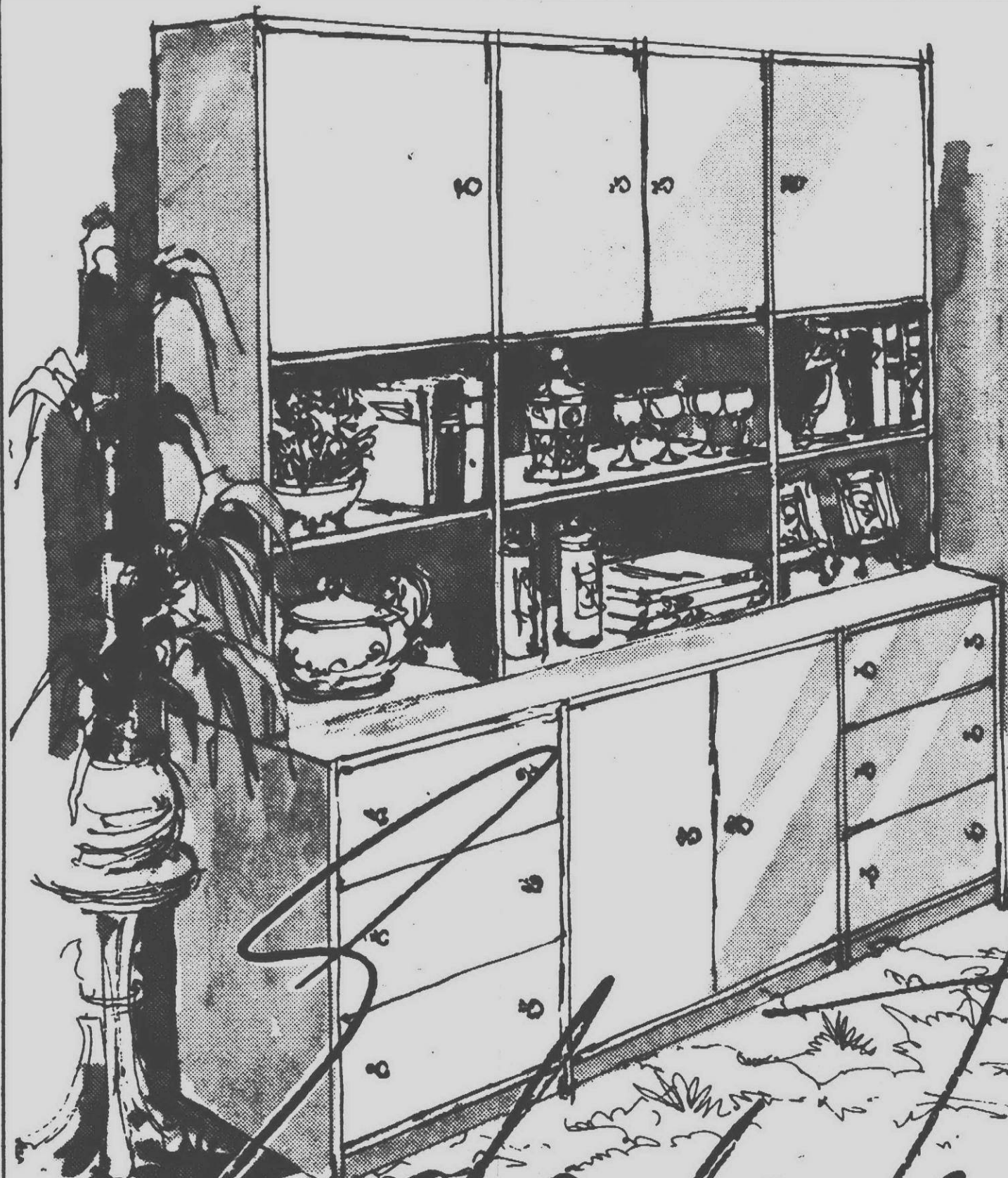

Girls golf added to athletic program

The Plymouth Board of Education voted Monday night, while approving the 1975-76 operating budget, to add girls golf as a new sport this spring.

The sport was added when the board voted 4-3 to approve an amendment to a motion made to approve the budget. The approval of the \$17.4 million budget was by a unanimous 7-0 vote.

Voting against adding girls golf were trustees Joseph Gray, Dr. E.J. McClendon and Gary Mirto.

THE AMENDMENT was offered by Marcia Borowski and supported by Tom Yack.

Borowski said the \$2,000 needed to begin a girls' golf program should come from the existing athletic budget. She mentioned that since the athletic budget was submitted last January, only \$1,000 had been cut, or from those which have such as coaches clinics, \$250 for custodial services and \$500 for uniforms.

She suggested the \$2,000 for girls golf could come from areas in the budget which haven't been cut, or from those which have such as coaches clinics category where none of the money has been spent yet.

Marda Benson commented that participation of girls in athletics has substantially increased in the district over the past couple years without increased cost to the district, which has placed a strain on the athletic budget.

Gray said he would support adding girls golf only if the board voted to reinstate the \$1,000 already cut from the athletic budget. "Let's not start a program and have other programs suffer. Let's do it right by funding it adequately or don't put the program in."

A couple Saturdays ago Gray had been in favor of adding girls golf within the existing athletic budget, but Monday night he said he had done some research and was opposed

unless more money was put into the budget.

THE MOTION to approve the operating budget was made by George Lawton and supported by Mirto.

Lawton's motion also included a provision that the budget will be placed on the agenda for ongoing review on the fourth board meeting of each month.

The budget has a \$83,500 balance for contingencies which may be eroded within two weeks. Superintendent John M. Hoben said he expects to learn within two weeks how much additional state aid the district will lose from the impending budget cut to be ordered by Gov.

Of the \$17.4 million revenues, 82 per cent comes from local sources and 16 per cent from the state. On the expenditure side, 85 per cent of the budget is spent for salaries and fringe benefits—\$14.7 million.

The district levies 29.01 mills for operation plus 6.59 mills for debt retirement for a total levy of 35.6 mills (\$35.60 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation).

In the instructional area, almost \$9.4 million is spent. The allocation among subject area of these funds are: 23.9 per cent for language arts, 13.3 per cent for mathematics, 11 per cent for social studies, 8.3 per cent for science, 6.4 per cent for pupil personnel services, 5.3 for physical education, 5 per cent for art, 4.2 per cent for music, 3.5 per cent for kindergarten, 3.3 per cent for multi-media, 3.2 per cent for reading improvement, 3 per cent for industrial education, 2.7 per cent for vocational education, 2.6 per cent for business education, 1.6 per cent for foreign languages, and fractions of one per cent for other areas such as driver education, community services and the school farm.

The Cultural Center as an asset is debated by commission hopefuls

(Following is another in a series of articles examining issues discussed by candidates for the Plymouth City Commission in an open forum sponsored by the Plymouth League of Women Voters. Eight are running for four seats in the Nov. 4 election.)

Among the questions discussed by candidates for the Plymouth City Commission is whether the Plymouth Cultural Center is an asset to the city.

LES HOWES, commented: "Yes, I definitely feel it is an asset. But if it isn't, it is too late to change because it's already built."

Realtors who show potential buyers around the community always show them the cultural center. Howes added, because it's a selling point.

"We should make the center profitable which isn't easy. But we can sell use of the center and bring in more revenue. The city should subsidize it as long as possible within reason. With a better selling job, I believe more and more people will rent rooms there."

Mary Childs commented that the cultural center wasn't built to pay for itself in four years. "It will take a long time to pay off the bonds. But look at the use, skating time is filled."

"It's like anything else that is new, people must learn it's there and learn how to use it. The cultural center is a very lovely spot for a wedding reception, and it has been a very good spot for the antique mart. As time passes, more use will be made of the center."

Beverly McAninch said it wasn't intended that the money from operating revenues of the cultural center be used to pay off the bonds. But the first year of operation, she added, the center lost \$50,000 and an additional 1/2-mill had to be allocated by the city to cover that loss.

"The second year some \$30,000 was lost on operation and we are still losing. But we are stuck with the cultural center, it's built, and we'll do the best we can."

DAVID PUGH said he felt the cultural center was an asset to the community and added that a concerted effort should be made to reach a break-even point on operations.

Scott Dodge suggested that possibly an addition to the cultural center area would expand its use, and suggested that private enterprise could also use the center to increase revenue for operations.

John Cummings mentioned he promoted a van show in the cultural center with \$1 million worth of equipment brought in. "The arena should be rented out when not in use. And people coming to Plymouth should be able to

find out where the cultural center is. We need signs on Main Street pointing the way."

"The cultural center could be a gold mine. For instance, we need a rifle range someplace in the area. Why not have a gun range in the cultural center?"

TEX THOMAN said the center definitely was an asset.

The center is now being run better as a business enterprise, he added, and the operation revenues will start increasing because of this efficiency.

"You seem to be worried about operational expenses and the bonds. Well, once that mortgage is paid off, the center will be a large profit-maker."

Deputy trained to guard Presidents

Richard M. Novak, a 26-year veteran with the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, has been promoted to

chief inspector after serving nearly three years as inspector.

Novak, a resident of Livonia, will be in charge of the road patrol, Metropolitan Airport detail, as well as de-

ties stationed at the courts and Wayne County jail.

Additional units under his command will be the helicopter division and the criminal investigation division.

Novak was named inspector in January, 1973. He had served as deputy inspector at the road patrol headquarters on Henry Ruff Road near Michigan prior to his promotion in 1973. He will continue to headquarter at the road patrol base.

THE NEW CHIEF inspector joined the Sheriff's department in Oct. 1949 following four years with the U.S. Marines as a communicator.

In 1950 he was assigned to the civil division and in 1953 to the detective bureau. He was promoted to sergeant in 1958 and to lieutenant in 1965.

Novak said that when he was discharged from the Marine Corps in 1949 he had thoughts of seeking employment with the telephone company because of his military training. He decided, however, to apply to the Sheriff's department.

"This was the best move I ever made."

NOVAK WAS instrumental in organizing the helicopter program which has been used successfully in conjunction with the road patrol cars in tracing and locating suspects or problems in the Wayne County area.

The 10-man metro squad, under Novak's command, has been successful in tracking and breaking up numerous suspected drug rings.

News of his promotion by Sheriff William Lucas was received by Novak

upon his return from two weeks of special training in Washington, D. C. and Quantico, Va.

He was among a select group of command officers from all over the United States to be invited by the FBI and Secret Service bureau to attend the school which stressed the protective responsibilities of police departments. Only one other officer from Michigan was selected for the school.

The training consisted of a week at Quantico with the FBI and a week in Washington with the secret service bureau.

Novak was born in Pennsylvania, coming to Detroit when he was three years old. Before moving to Livonia, he and his family lived in Redford Township since 1954.

He will perform the dual role of chief inspector and inspector until a new inspector is selected by Lucas sometime within the near future.

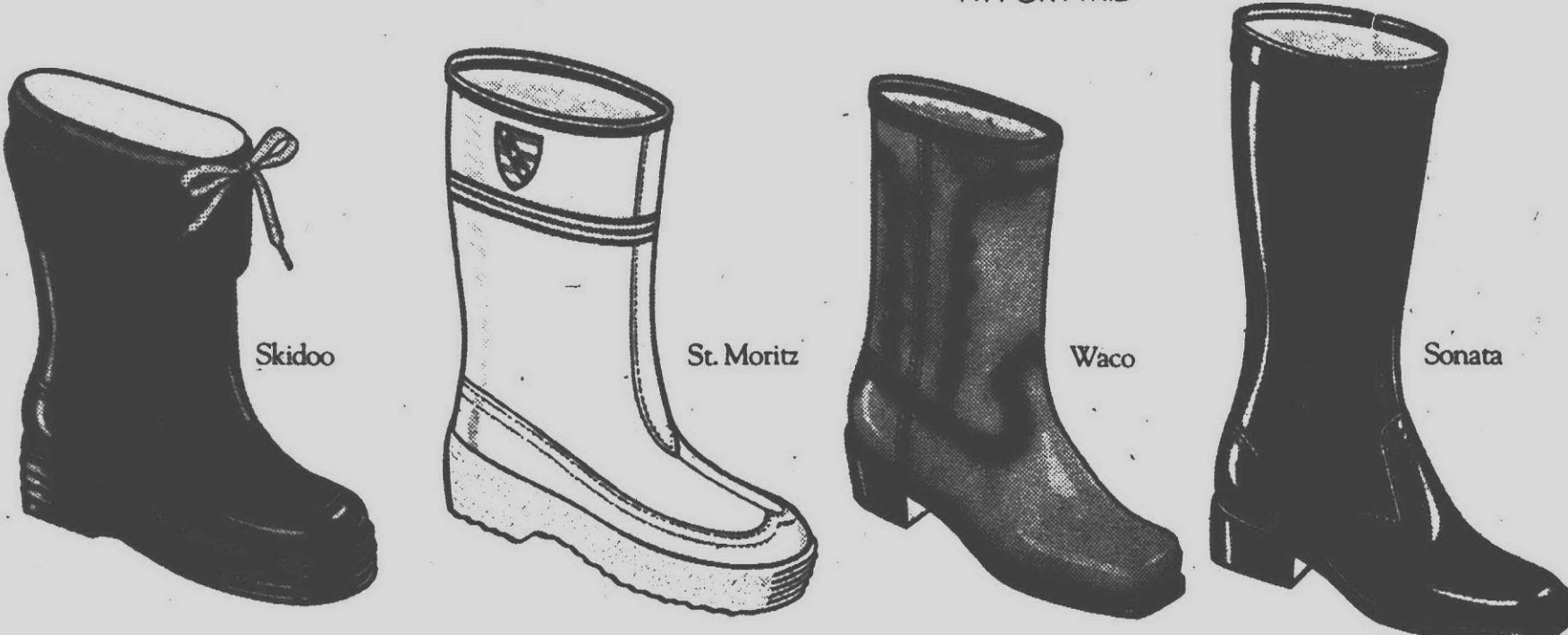

think it will create that much damage if we wait until we get the information on cuts in state aid. One or two weeks delay on this won't destroy the children."

IN RESPONSE to a question, Kee said if the 10 were dismissed the students they are now teaching would have to be absorbed into other classrooms.

"That's where the problem lies," said Yack.

"If this is the case," countered Mirto, "then we can never lay off because reduction in teachers will always disrupt classrooms. I'm concerned about us offering contracts and two weeks later taking them away."

Lawton remarked: "There's only one unhappy way to balance a budget and that's not to spend money. If we offer contracts to 10 additional teachers, in the desperate situation we are in, then the responsibility rests directly on the board on whether we have a balanced budget at the end of the year."

"I don't every want to decide not to spend money by holding somebody by their toenails above an alligator pit," Borowski answered. "If we ask teachers to teach full-time, which these 10 are doing, then we should pay them full-time or get them out and see how we would absorb their students."

Kee said the subs are getting paid \$28 a day and the permanent subs are getting \$40 a day, which is still below pay for regular teachers.

It would be extremely disruptive in mid-term or mid-year, Kee added, to eliminate the 10 teachers and make adjustments. "We must look at different ways of staffing, but it would be extremely disruptive to make these types of moves now."

Marda Benson, board president, pointed out the resolution was only to authorize Kee to offer contracts. The ten wouldn't receive contracts this week, she added, but would be recommended for hiring as individuals to the board.

Lawton said he realized educational practices and philosophy were involved in the debate. "But you are also talking about \$100,000 which, if spent, could completely deplete our fund equity and put us in the red."

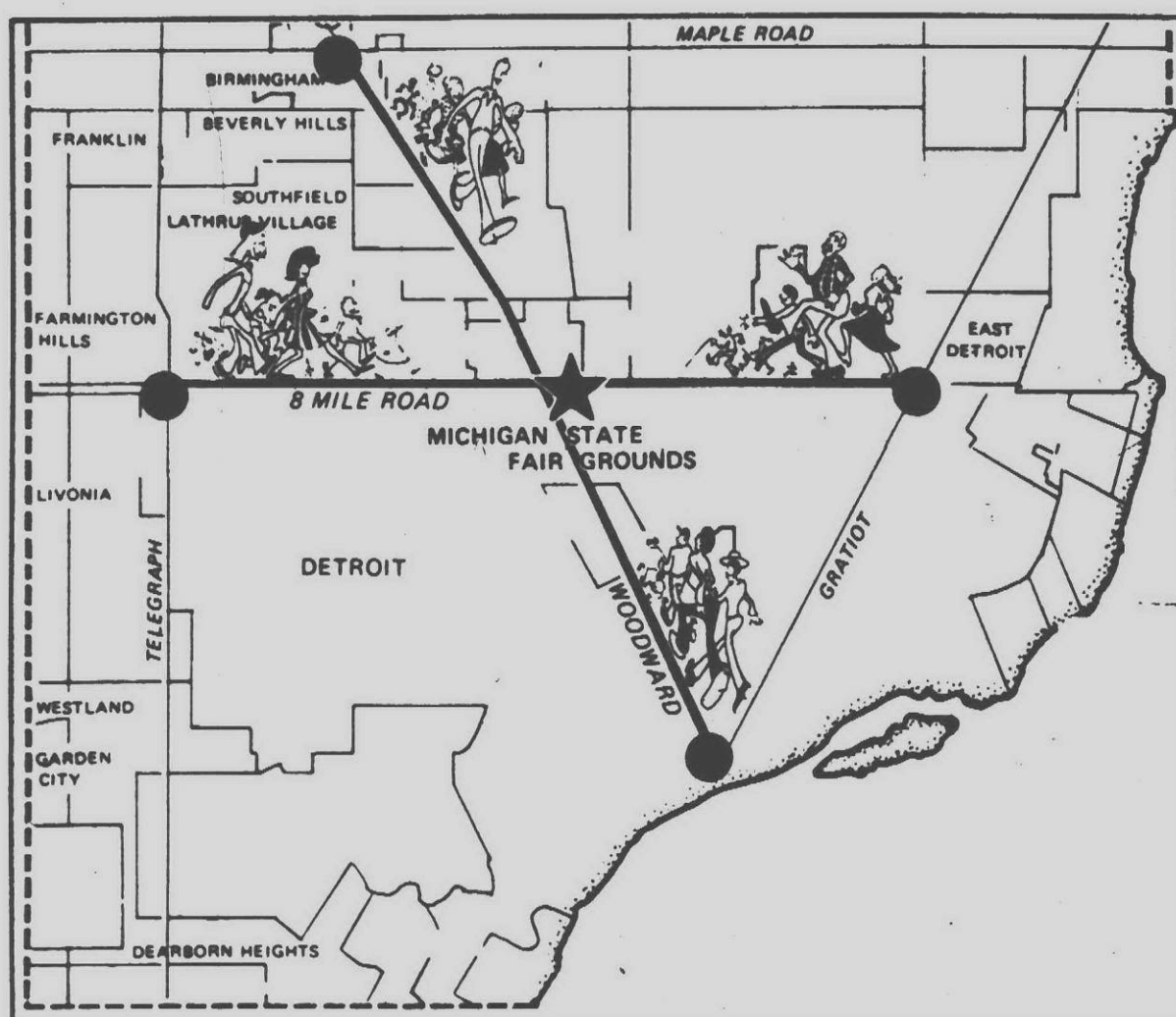

How to prevent a tragic Halloween

Halloween can be a safe holiday, without tragedy, if a few suggestions offered by the Plymouth City Police and Michigan State Police are followed.

The departments are working jointly in preparing safety tips which have been distributed by the Plymouth Community School District.

ONE SAFETY measure is a metal detector which the ITT Corporation has set up in the lobby of the Plymouth City Hall, 201 S. Main.

The machine can detect any foreign metallic material which may be in candy or other treats. All residents are encouraged to use this service from 6-10 p.m. Friday, Halloween Night, Oct. 31, and from 1-4 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 1.

"In recent years, reports have come to police agencies about dangerous or harmful treats passed out to those seeking treats from door-to-door," comments Plymouth Police Chief Timothy C. Ford.

"While there has been only one such report in the city, the police agencies strongly recommend that all parents exercise careful control over the treats received.

"We strongly urge that children not consume any of the treats until they have been inspected. This should be done by parents or with the use of the metal detector in city hall. All are welcome to use the detector service. Any tainted or altered material should be reported to the police immediately upon discovery."

THE POLICE departments urge that Halloween be celebrated on Friday, Oct. 31. Suggestions include:

- Do trick or treating between hours of 6-8 p.m. Turn on all porch lights.

- An adult should accompany children.
- Cross streets only at corner.

- Use battery-powered lights in pumpkins.
- Have children carry identification.
- Avoid taking candy or treats from strangers on the streets.

CHIEF FORD adds: "Devils night and Halloween are always good times to be enjoyed by the young and old."

"The objective of the police department in this area is to keep the activities within reasonable limits. There is a difference between pranks and activities which result in destruction or theft of property.

"We are certain, however, that ghosts and goblins will avoid extending their activities to the point where it will be necessary for the police officers to intervene.

"The police department urges everyone to exercise the greatest care and caution to make this a happy and safe Halloween for the entire community. We hope that as usual, there are few tricks and many treats."

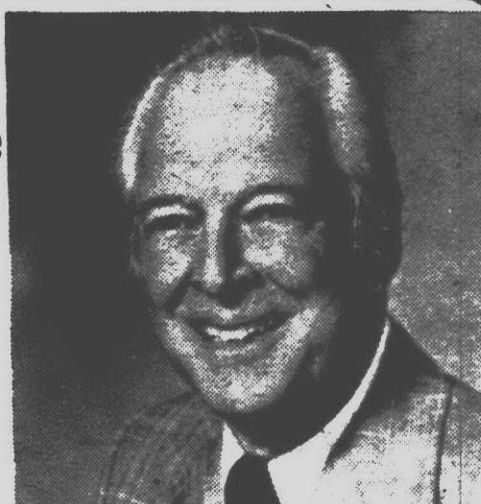

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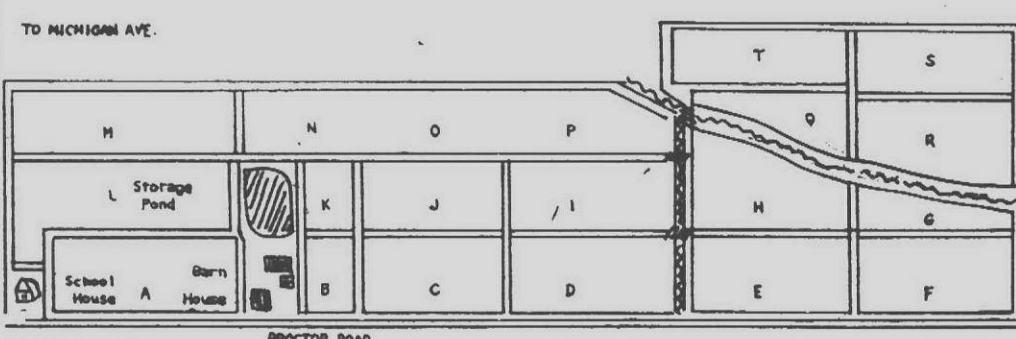

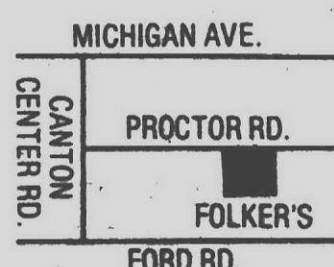

Try on a garden for Halloween

Costumes for trick or treating on Halloween have become big business nowadays. Cinderella and Frankenstein come boxed and ready to wear and can be purchased from any department or dime store. This Halloween, why not sit down with a child and dream up a costume that can be made from articles in the house instead of running out and buying a boxed witch? But, one thing to remember is to make the costumes safe.

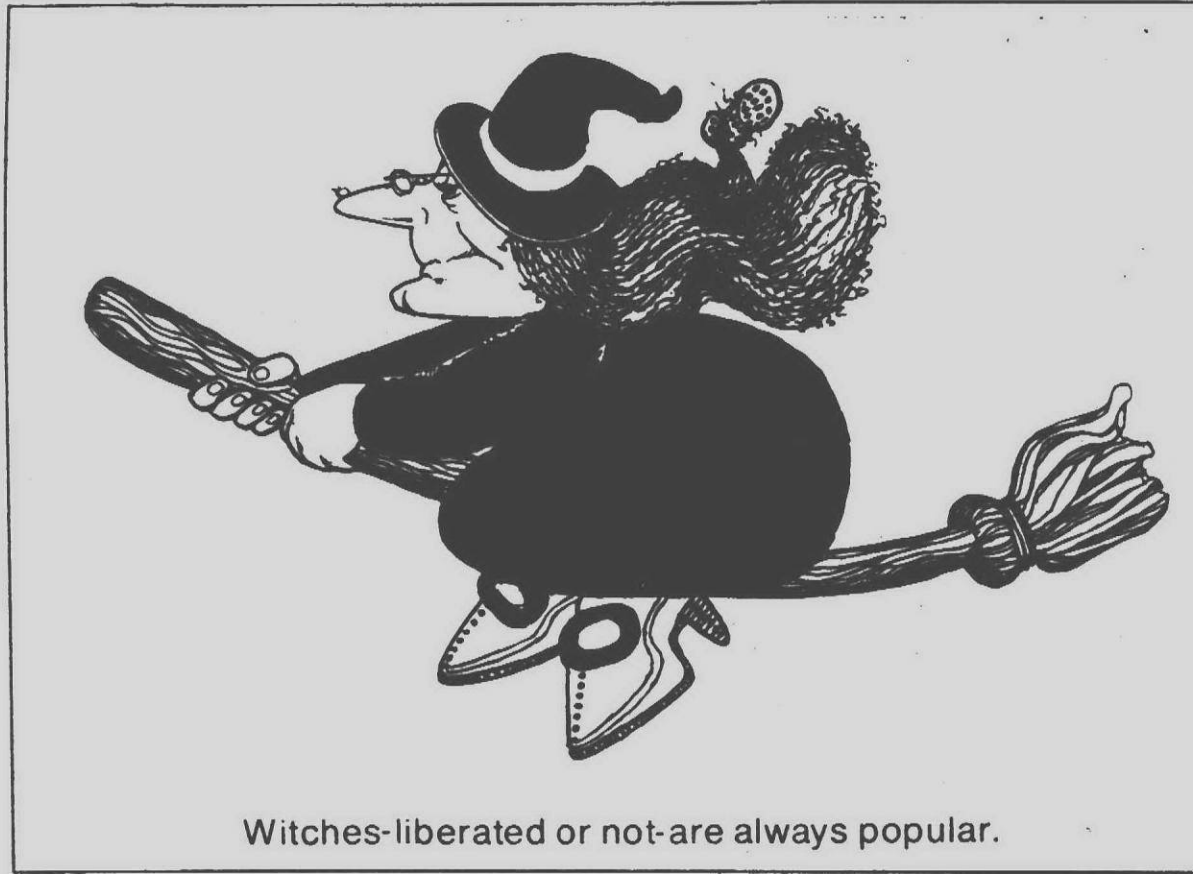
Homemade costumes can be used

by children for trick or treating and also by older folks going to Halloween parties, doing their trick or treating with an empty glass and ice cubes.

Old sheets—not necessarily white—are a good starting place. With all the prints available, it's possible to be disguised as a garden just using a flowered sheet and carrying a hoe and water pail. If a white sheet is used, cut it in wide strips, wrap it around the entire body and place an old hat painted red on your head and go as a cigarette. Sheets are not just for ghosts.

IF ANY wooden shoes are handy, a milkmaid is a pretty Halloween character. Braid hair, wear a dress and apron and carry a plastic pail for candy (or punch, whatever the situation). A hobo is a nice, grubby Halloween choice using a pillow and a lot of ashes for face and clothing.

A liberated witch can wear black pants and top, using a straggly wig and carrying a sign supporting ERA in place of the ever-faithful broom-

ick. With the bicentennial already under way, patriotic costumes also are in order. Wrap yourself in flag material and carry an imitation torch made from a can with a handle at the bottom—party-goers can use a beer mug instead.

WHATEVER THE costume, if a child is wearing it to trick or treat, remember to keep it safe. A light-colored costume embellished with reflective tape should be used if the child will be out during dusk or dark.

Costumes that are too big pose tripping hazards. So do garments that have wide capes, long skirts or trousers and dangling sleeves. Shoes should also fit properly.

Homemade costumes can be made flame-retardant by dipping the material in a solution of two quarts of warm water, seven ounces of borax and three ounces of boric acid. Thoroughly wet the garment in the mixture, let it drip dry, then iron. This treatment will last until the costume is washed or gets wet. When buying a costume, look for the flame-retardant label.

PAINTED FACES are much safer than masks which can hide oncoming traffic and other Halloween hazards from a child's view. Each child will look distinctive, and regular cosmetic make-up is more comfortable and cooler.

Motorists are advised to watch carefully for children on Halloween night. Slow down in residential areas and

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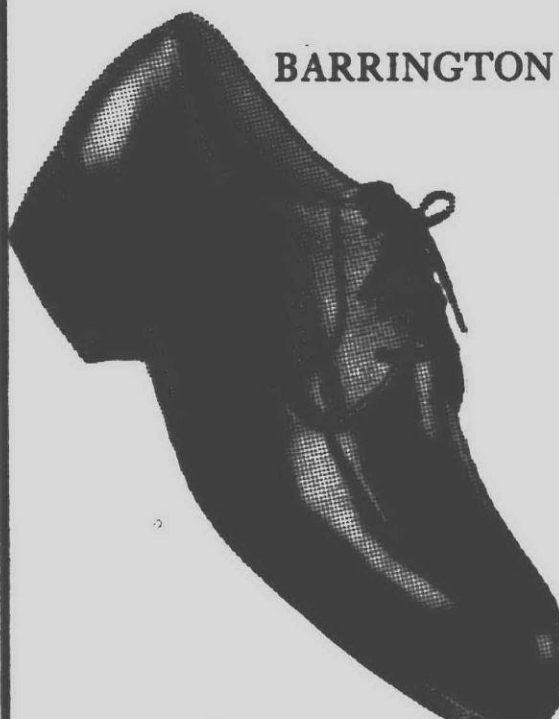
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Who's afraid of the Big Good Wolf?

Local school children aren't, once they've met pretty Nahanni

Beth Duman's knowledge of wolf sociology came in handy 1½ years ago when she gave birth to daughter Katherine.

Bob and Beth Duman's wolf, Nahanni, was elated, Beth recalled, "but I had to watch her because I definitely did not want her carrying the baby around by the head."

"So I growled at her (the way the alpha female in a pack would growl at a subordinate female), and Nahanni accepted me as a mother wolf taking care of her puppy."

Besides being a member of the Duman "pack" in Oakland County's rural White Lake Township, Nahanni has another distinction. The three-year-old grey timber wolf is probably the most famous animal among kids in the metropolitan area since Jo Mendi, the chimp at the zoo.

In the company of Mrs. Duman, Nahanni has visited more than 200 schools in this area and 80 in Grand Rapids, and has been petted by tens of thousands of youngsters. So if you take your youngster to hear "Peter and the Wolf" and find him cheering for the wolf, it may be because of Nahanni.

"SHE'S GENERALLY submissive to people," says Mrs. Duman, who tells everyone not to show fear around Nahanni because "she picks out submissive kids—maybe it's the adrenalin—and growls."

A former teacher, Mrs. Duman takes the 64-pound *Canis lupus lycaon* to schools to give children these messages:

- "Wolves are predators, animals that kill other animals for their food. But there is not one authenticated case of a healthy wolf or pack of wolves ever attacking and killing a person in all of North America."

- "Wolves generally can catch only old or diseased animals and some unprotected young. Wolves play an important role in preventing over-popu-

lation in game animals by continual culling of the diseased and weak animals." (Man, it could be added, does the opposite, seeking out the trophy animals and thus weakening the species.)

- "Wolves kill only to eat. They have a highly developed social order in the pack. Unlike dogs, wolves rarely fight with each other."

Nevertheless, the Michigan Deer Hunters Association still insists that wolves slaughter herds of deer and often don't bother to eat their kills. Friends of the wolves, however, say that if wolves could outrun healthy deer, the wolves would eliminate their own food supply and exterminate themselves—a clear absurdity.

IN A SCHOOL hallway, Nahanni looks like, and is sometimes mistaken for, a big dog. "Wolves and dogs can interbreed. They're genetically the same species," says Beth, a former Southfield girl with a background in biology.

But dogs have had wolfish character traits—as distinguished from biological traits—bred out of them, she adds, and so wolves have different personalities.

As her husband Bob and daughter Katherine played with Nahanni on the floor of their home, Beth told what makes wolves different.

"She can't be kept in a house long," Beth said frankly, "because she scent-marks everything by urinating on it." Male dogs retain some of that trait by scent-marking their territories but Nahanni's scent-marking is extreme in comparison.

So Nahanni has a pair of large, tree-shaded pens with a sign that says "Beware of the Dog." They don't manufacture "Beware of the Wolf" signs, you know.

Dogs can be taught to obey commands. Nahanni is untrainable.

"Nahanni is social-climbing. Bob is obviously head of the 'pack,' and she is especially submissive to him," Beth added.

In wolf sociology, the head male is

called "alpha wolf." In the Duman household, alpha is Wolfgang, a deaf, neutered male Dalmatian. Nahanni lays back her ears and curls under her rump in his presence.

In turn, Nahanni dominates little Cricket, the small black female dog in the household.

DOGS LIKE TO play "fetch" and "tug." Nahanni's game is "stalk and pounce."

"She's much more active than a dog. She tears around the place. When you're on the phone, she knows your attention is diverted, and she chews things," Beth said.

Nahanni uses her mouth for social contact far more than a dog would, although she's very gentle about it.

"She has cow-hocked legs," Beth went on. "That's been bred out of dogs because people want their pets to have nice, straight legs. And she has coarse fur, but dogs have been bred to have soft fur."

Whereas female dogs come into season for about two weeks twice a year, Nahanni has one four-week season in February. Apparently her ready-to-mate scent is weaker than a dog's.

NAHANNI WAS born in Aqualand, a commercial zoo in northeastern Wis-

consin which has provided such animals as otters for Walt Disney movies. She dominated her litter of three.

At nine days, she began nursing on a human-held bottle and so became socialized to people. If socializing isn't done immediately, Beth said, a wolf never becomes accustomed to humans.

The Dumans bought her there, naming her for a wild Canadian River, and vowed she would have "maximum social contacts—at least 30 people a day," Beth said.

Nahanni's two brothers were less lucky. Within a year, their purchasers had sold them back to zoos, which Beth says is the pattern. Once wolves have been around humans, they cannot be returned to the wild.

SHORTLY AFTER the Dumans brought Nahanni to Michigan in 1972, the state imposed tough new restrictions on the issuance of wolf permits. They will be issued for educational and research purposes only—and very sparingly. A private individual today can forget about having a wolf for a pet.

Besides Nahanni, there are only two other licensed wolves in Michigan, one in the Flint area, the other in

Battle Creek. Beth cautions against going to breeders who advertise animals as half- or three-quarters wolf. "Ask the breeder to show you the parent wolf," she advises. "Usually they can't."

MILDLY KOOKY, though in the pleasantest possible way, Beth went to Brace School and Southfield High School and earned a degree in biology at Wayne State University.

She taught biology at St. Andrew High School in Detroit but was fired for being too friendly with a nun who was considering leaving the convent. Beth then taught at Bishop Foley High in Madison Heights "but retired to have the wolf."

Husband Bob, once a Benedictine monk, studied biology in order to get a job. He came here from Pennsylvania in the late '60s to work for the University of Detroit on a much-publicized but ultimately inconclusive bacteriology study of the Huron River. He's now a technical analyst in computers with Michigan Bell Telephone Co.

A school can schedule Beth and Nahanni by contacting the North American Wildlife Park Foundation, Inc., Battle Ground, Ind. 47920.

NAWPF handles their exhibition permit, pays their liability insurance, does their booking, provides inexpensive books on wolves that Beth sells, and gives the Dumans access to wolf research.

The modest fee covers expenses and mileage.

AT HOME, Nahanni is loose only in her pen and during her occasional visits to the house, occupied by the Dumans, the dogs, two cats, tropical fish and a box turtle.

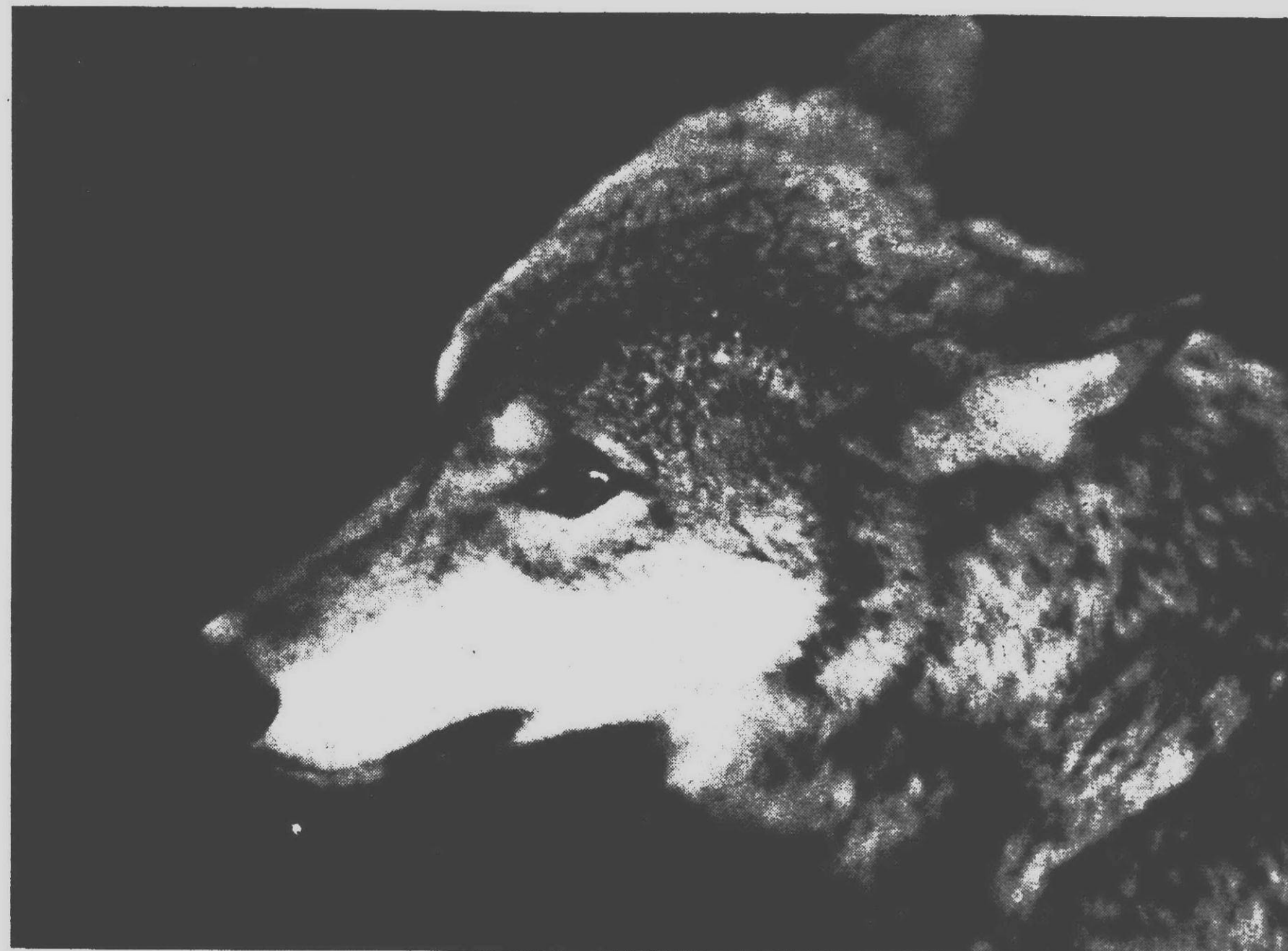
Nahanni eats dog food. "The first time she ran loose and someone found a dead chicken, we'd have a legal suit on our hands," Beth said.

"Nahanni has never really barked," she said. Barking is something dogs have picked up in their contacts with humans, it seems.

Instead, Nahanni prefers to howl. "Wolves howl to bring the pack together, and members of the pack recognize each other."

To show what she meant, Beth began their pack howl in a clear coloratura. Bob joined in with a sound punctuated by yips, and Nahanni had to work hard to be heard.

"Everybody howl," Beth hollered between howls. "C'mon, Tim, you have to howl, too."

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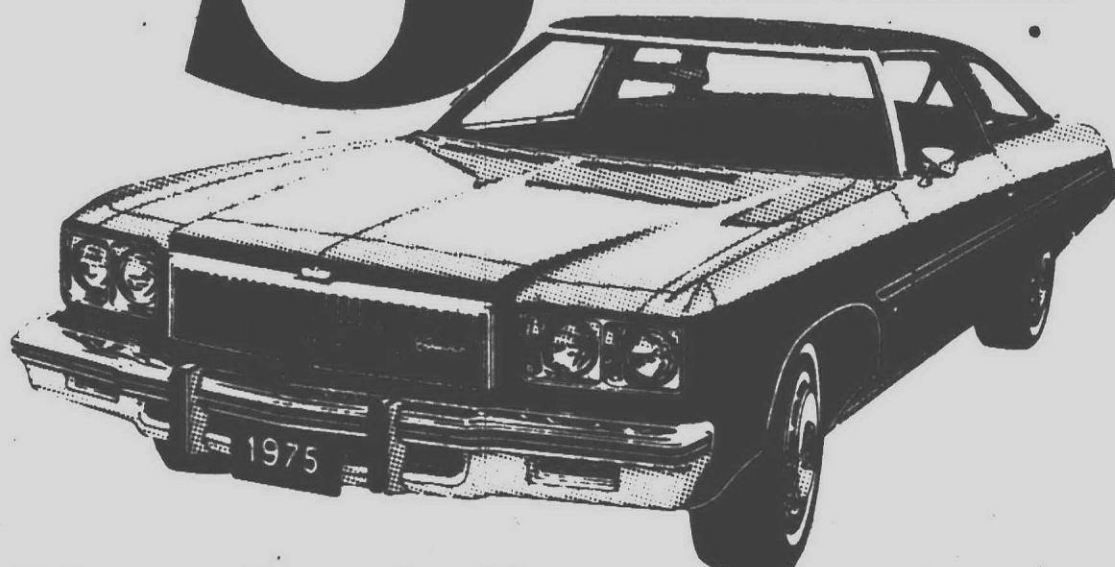
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Some good—and bad—tricks for Halloween

Local folks can save Parliament

While the colonies are engaged Tuesday in their sport of municipal elections, back home in the mother country they'll be hanging Guy Fawkes in effigy again Nov. 5.

Fifteen years before that shipload of transients sailed from England and later fell in love with old Cape Cod, some of the dissidents who dwelled around and about pastoral England vowed they'd had enough of King James I and his government. They went about solving their tiff the hard way.

Their solution was to sneak some kegs of gunpowder to the cellar of the House of Lords, apparently with the intention of blowing most of the royalty to kingdom come on the day the 1605 Parliament was to convene.

As often happens to such sinister plots, both in real life and on television, somebody let the cat out of the bag, and the king's royal fuzz were at the cellar door as a greeting committee when Guy and his buddies arrived, matches in hand.

HISTORIANS HAVE called this aborted uprising the "Gunpowder Plot," which demonstrates a shocking lack of imagination, and its annual perpetuation long ago became known simply as Guy Fawkes Day.

As in many losing situations, there has to be a fall guy, and maybe that's how Fawkes went into the books as the chief conspirator.

Guy was only one of a number who were dispatched to their graves ere the sun set on that infamous day, but whether he was kingpin of the conspirators seems to have been lost in the retelling.

ONE SUSPECTS that down to the tasteless end, he never knew who spilled the beans, but later on it turned out that one of the mob had a relative who was a member of Parliament.

This led to a personal warning to his lordship not to risk his life and limb on the day in question because things were going to be go "boom," and that's when the law moved in.

The reason that in England they still pop cannons and corks and hang Guy Fawkes in effigy every Nov. 5 is to celebrate that as the date Parliament was saved.

Somehow it seems an interesting coincidence that the 1975 elections in the colonies fall so close to Guy Fawkes Day. Your way, figuratively, to "save Parliament" is to vote.

Public transit's best friends oppose Milliken-Young deal

When some of your best allies are against you, you've got trouble. And right now, Gov. Bill Milliken has big trouble over the deal he made with Detroit Mayor Coleman Young to "restructure" the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

Two of the best friends SEMTA and the cause of public transportation ever had are State Sen. Carl Pursell, a Republican from Plymouth whose district includes Livonia and Redford, and Oakland County Commissioner Larry Pernick, a Democrat from Southfield.

Right now, SEMTA, the seven-county regional transit agency, has a nine-member board. Six members are appointed by SEMCOG, the regional planning agency, and three by the governor. Under the Milliken-Young deal, SEMTA would have a 13-member board—five named by Mayor Young, five suburbanites chosen by SEMCOG and three by the governor (with one hooker: The governor's three would be subject to approval of six of the other 10).

PERNICK IS aware not only of the Milliken-Young deal but of other ideas—such as letting county boards of commissioners name the transportation authority board members.

In very thoughtful remarks prepared for the Senate committee studying implementation of the Milliken-Young deal, Pernick stated the case for continuing SEMCOG as the appointing authority.

"SEMCOG is the metropolitan planning organization for federal monies and, as such, serves as the forum for cooperative decision-making by principal elected officials of general purpose government."

"SEMCOG is the only vehicle in the region which has representation from all levels of government—county, city and township."

In other words, Pernick was putting his finger on the heart of the problem: SEMCOG's general assembly has a fully regional point of view. A transportation authority board appointed by provincial, balkanized local governments is less likely to think of the common good of all five million people in the region.

The goal, said Pernick, "is the system itself—

and not the glory of the governmental unit that runs the system."

PURSELL, AN ASTUTE politician as well as a visionary, zeroed in on another flaw—the apportionment of SEMTA seats.

The Milliken-Young deal would give Detroit five seats and the suburbs five seats. Yet Detroit's population is 1.3 million while western Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties have something like 2.8 million. That kind of apportionment grossly violates the "one man, one vote" principle that Coleman Young used to support when he was a civil libertarian back in his Senate days.

Pursell told his fellow senators Mayor Young's current reaction to that principle: "Yeah, Carl, but I have the buses."

To which Pursell replied: "Sure, Coleman, but buses don't vote!"

THE MORAL is that there's no place for "Detroit versus the suburbs" thinking. We are one region—one economic whole.

We can't afford to be provincial. But provincialism is precisely what we're going to get if we have Detroit aggressively pushing its own point of view, western Wayne County thinking only of its interests, Oakland seeking to take care of Oakland.

We're all in this public transportation problem together. And there's only one place where folks from all seven counties with their 200-plus local governments come together: In the General Assembly of SEMCOG, the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. If we're ever going to stop thinking like selfish balkan states, then SEMCOG must be the agency to pick the transportation authority board.

When you have two enlightened champions of public transportation like Larry Pernick and Carl Pursell saying that, then it's clear the Milliken-Young deal is in big trouble.

Editor:

This is to voice my opinion of the environmental protection agency regulations being formulated by the subcommittee on environmental pollution of the Senate Public Works Committee and the subcommittee on public health and environment of the House Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee.

It is my understanding of the present bill before these committees for hearings that they will eliminate virtually all development of undeveloped land in the U.S. without a minimum of a one-year delay and in most cases will permit no development whatsoever.

The real estate that is developed in this country and in our area in particular will by no stretch of the imagination handle the needs at present, let alone those of upcoming generations.

The previous law, which listed two pollutant elements in the atmosphere for control and regulation—sulfur dioxide and particulates—was hard enough to live with in developing the commercial, residential and recreational needs of the people. The new regulations, as proposed, listing six pollutants, can be interpreted as nothing but another bureaucratic attempt at absolute control of the progress and lifestyle of the citizens of the U.S.

While recognizing the need of providing minimum air control measures to guarantee the health of our air, by no stretch of the imagination can we condone this no-growth federal land control on the basis of a single criteria—that being whether we are for "pure" air. We all recognize that there is no such thing as "pure" air, only reasonable air, in any developed area.

If we are going to control the pollutants in air, the place to control them is not by saying there shall be no development or only development under strict federal control. Rather, it is by controlling the items that create pollution—i.e., automobile exhaust, heating plant exhaust, dust created by gravel roads and parking areas. This can be done certainly with a lot less control than is currently being proposed or that was in the present law which this proposal is supposed to supercede.

(Two very minor points: In the section called, "They would be required to reveal: Business interest where one is a partner director, officer, stockholder of more than \$1,000 or five per cent equity or employee": Where a person is required to file, as noted above, if their equity is 10 per cent in any business, then a complete reporting on the business itself must be filed. Further in that section: "Security given for debts and terms of repayment," that should read for debts of \$1,000 or more.

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Western Wayne conference boosters want nearby games

More than half of western Wayne County high schools have expressed at least mild interest in a proposal to form a new athletic league closer to everyone's home.

The two Redford Township school districts haven't commented, the two Garden City athletic directors are opposed, and both Franklin and Churchill in Livonia are reported to be satisfied with their present setups.

But officials in Wayne-Westland, Plymouth and Livonia are studying the matter with some degree of interest.

THE IDEA was often the subject of columns by George Maskin in the years when he was sports editor for the former Observer Newspapers. But little happened until early in October of this year when the Bentley Dads Club and Stevenson Boosters began rounding up support.

The obvious reasons are savings in gasoline for bus trips during an energy shortage, savings in overtime for bus drivers during a period of budget cuts and greater local attendance. One booster noted attendance falls off noticeably when people have to drive more than 10 miles to a football game.

There's another monetary angle: Attendance means revenue, and games closer to home mean more ticket sales on the "visitors' side of the field.

Other reasons appear after some study: Girls sports are drawing more participants and, with time, more spectators. Travel costs will soar not only with gasoline prices but also with the growing numbers of sports.

There is an unspoken political reason for more compact leagues: Suburban schools have consistently opposed cross-district busing with Detroit for integrated classrooms. How, the NAACP might argue, can suburbs justify busing students to football games the other side of Pontiac or down in Trenton?

THERE'S ANOTHER side to the argument.

"Several traditional rivalries have been built up over the years," notes another former sports editor, Tom Schram. "When Plymouth Salem plays Trenton in football, the emotion of the game itself often changes the outcome. Same with Churchill and Waterford Mott."

A Wayne-Westland official notes the possibility of vandalism prior to a game with a nearby, loathed rival.

Another Wayne-Westland official says there are positive gains from visiting other schools and "seeing how they operate." While that's an advantage to administrators, it wasn't seen as an advantage to students and parents, who go to football games for recreation.

ATHLETIC LEAGUES seem to have grown historically, with schools formed about the same time being in the same league.

Thus, Plymouth Salem, Livonia Bentley and Redford Union are in the same league as such long-established schools as Belleville, Dearborn, Allen Park and Trenton. On the other hand, Churchill, Plymouth Canton and Farmington Harrison are associated with Waterford Mott and Walled Lake Western, all young schools.

There is some logic, then, to pitting newer schools with less developed athletic programs against each other rather than against older, experienced schools. In time, of course, the argument literally wears out.

Garden City East and Livonia Franklin are satisfied because their league is fairly tight geographically right now: Glenn of Westland, SR's Thurston and North Farmington.

One school not included in the discussions is Clarenceville, which this year joined a new Metro West league with Annapolis of Dearborn Heights, Oak Park and Woodhaven—none of which has had stirring football records in the past.

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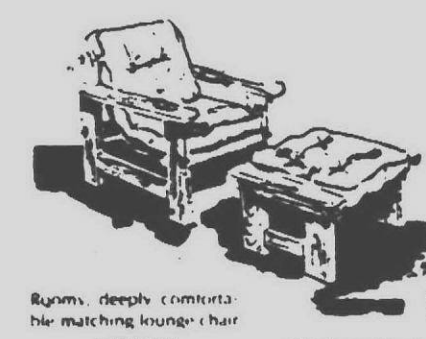
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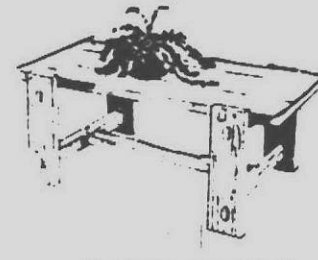
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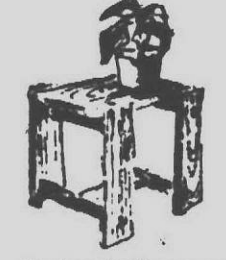
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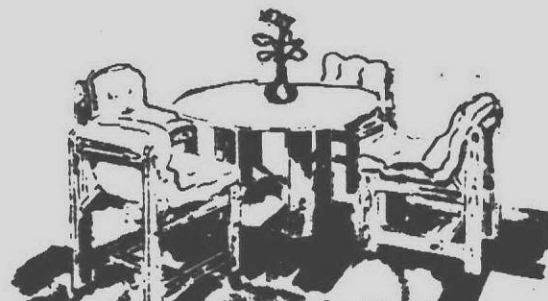
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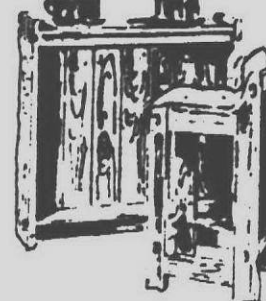
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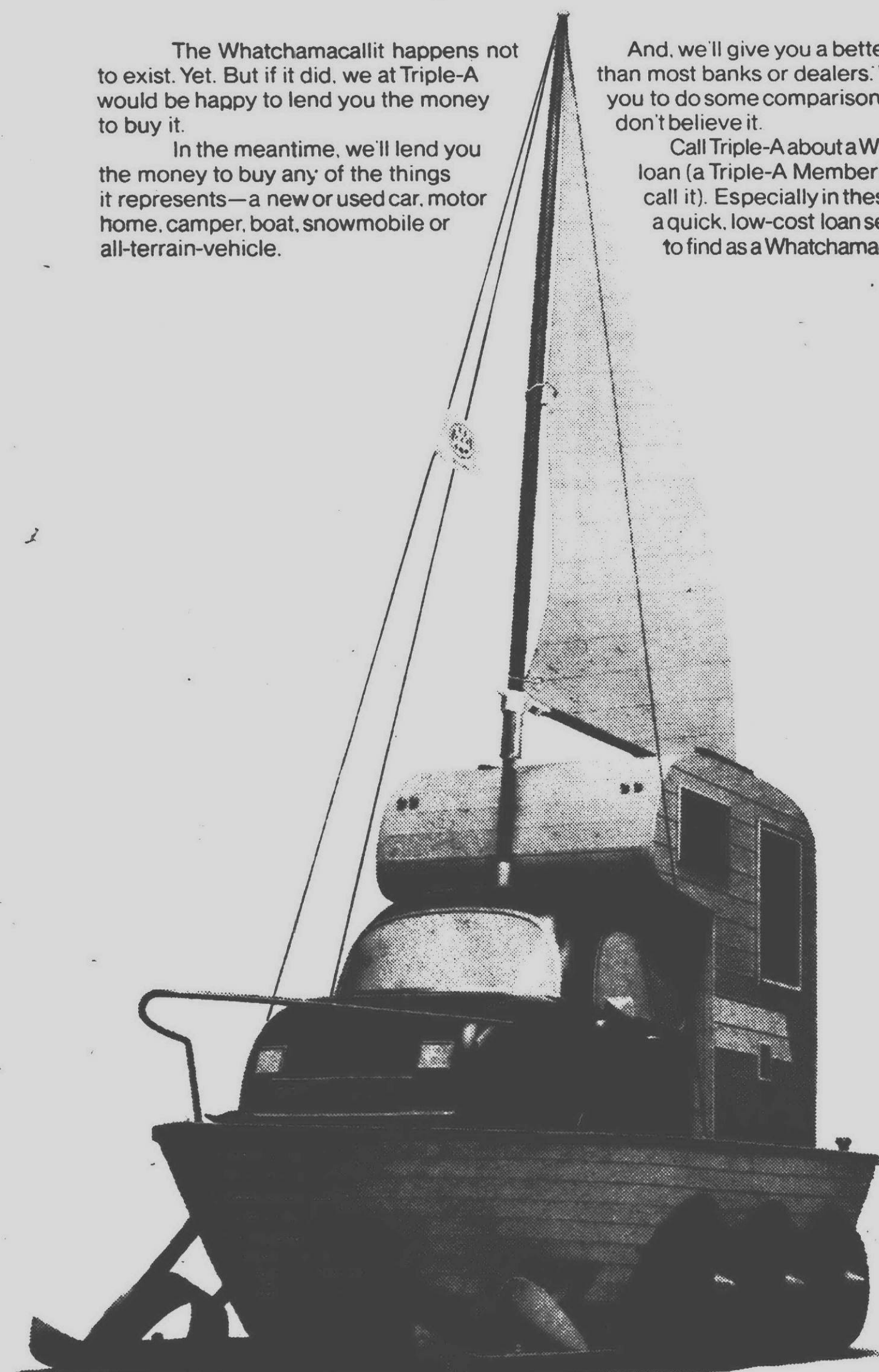
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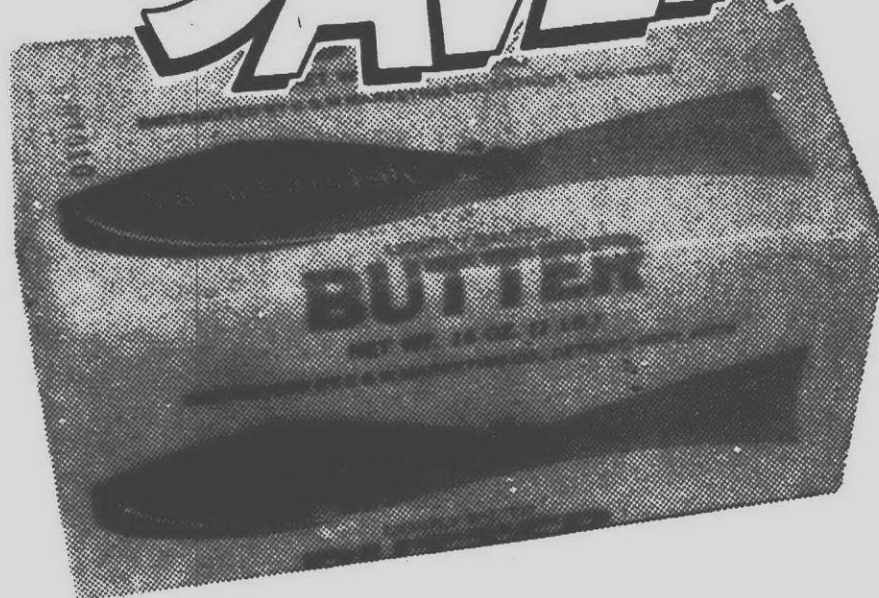
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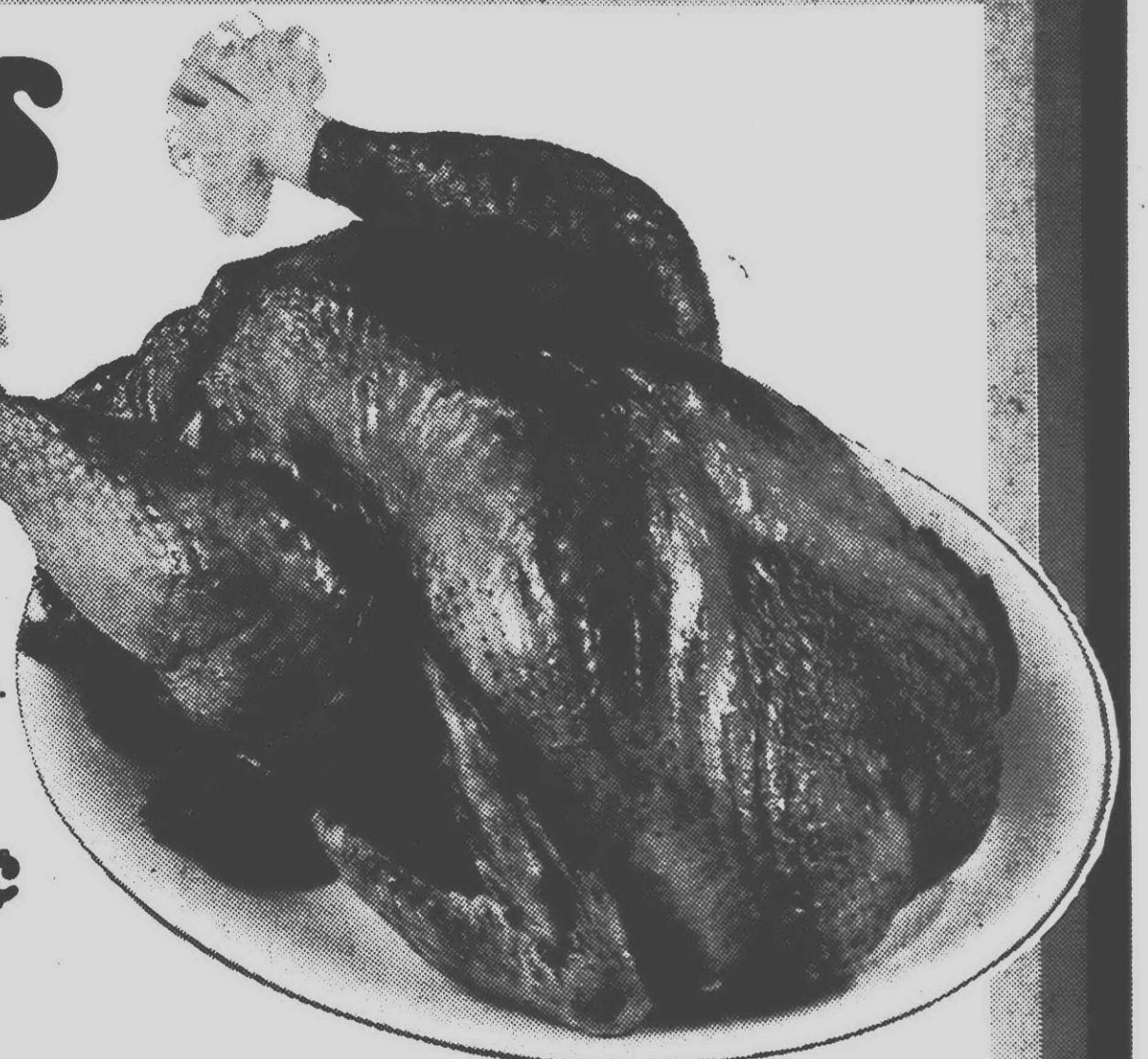
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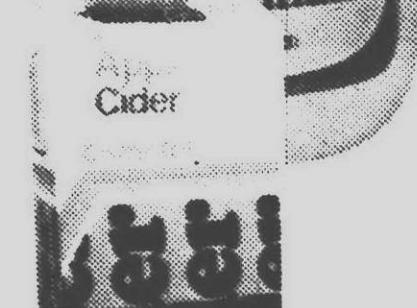
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Halloween with Gundella

It's witches' big night,
but they don't trick or treat
or go to masquerades

To a witch, Halloween is more than just a day, it's a season. October becomes "Halloween time" in much the same way that the whole month of December is thought of as "Christmas time."

It's a combination of beautiful colors, falling leaves that rustle as you walk through them, pumpkins at roadside stands, cider and donuts, and whole neighborhoods of houses wildly decorated with pictures of black cats, skeletons, bats, witches, ghosts, and goblins of all sorts, and jack-o-lanterns sitting on the doorstep.

To me, personally, it also means turning green frequently. I achieve this with food coloring in much the same way that witches in the Middle Ages dyed their skin with vegetable dyes to identify with the red, blue, or green witch cults of that day.

It is really quite effective when telling folk tales to children, and with the advent of color television, I am often asked to dye myself green for adults as well, when I am to appear on TV talk shows.

One time I was discussing this with WJR program director Hal Youngblood at a cocktail party when a young lady overheard part of our conversation and interrupted, asking, "do you really turn green?"

"Oh, yes," answered Hal, "ghastly green. You really ought to see her."

Before I had a chance to explain how it was done, she uttered in amazement, "Gee, and I thought I had psychic powers!"

OCTOBER IS my busiest month of the year. I am always invited to many Halloween parties throughout the month, and I sometimes have a

party of my own, but never, never, on Oct. 31, for that is the night our witch coven meets to observe the rites of winter.

Last year, I was hired to speak at a banquet in Troy, Ohio, at 6 p.m. on Halloween. I really wanted to do this, but I had to be back in Ann Arbor by 9 that night. It's a short flight, but there were no planes scheduled for the time I needed to leave.

So the company which hired me decided to charter a plane so that I could appear there at dinner, and be back here in time for our Ritual.

It worked out fine, and I was back with time to spare. When we landed, the pilot asked for my autograph, and wanted to be sure it was dated. He explained, "Otherwise, no one would believe that I spent Halloween night flying a witch to her coven meeting."

PERHAPS THE STRANGEST Halloween experience I ever had was a thing that happened in October, 1971. I was hired to entertain at the Wonderland shopping center in Livonia. It was to be a fun thing, with cauldrons, dry ice, etc., and of course I would be dyed green, dressed in black, and carrying a broom.

There was nothing serious about it, but some of the church people in the community became so upset about this that the show was canceled at the last minute to avoid a riot.

It seems that they had no objection to such a show if an actress played the part of the witch, but they objected strenuously to me, a real witch, doing so. They were really afraid of me.

Things seemed to have changed a great deal since then, however, for

this year, on Oct. 12, I was guest lecturer for the senior high students at the St. Paul Presbyterian Church in that same community.

HALLOWEEN IS ONE of the four main witchcraft sabbats. On this day, the coven meets to recognize the coming of winter, the long sleep of the earth.

Witches observe this day by looking back over the year just past, and asking themselves what they have done in the past year that they should not have done, and what they did not do that they should have.

Each witch writes her own petition in secret, listing her mistakes and shortcomings. (I suppose this is something like confession is to Catholics.)

Then she steps forward and places her folded paper in the ritual fire with much moaning, sighing, and expressions of grief and penance. This gets to be quite a noisy scene as, one by

one, her sister witches each follow suit.

THEN, WHEN the weeping and wailing becomes almost unbearable, the leader calls for silence, and demands of us that we spend no more time mourning over the past failures, but instead, look ahead and plan to do better in the seasons to come, and reminds us that there is no better time to start mending our ways than right now.

The ritual continues with each witch vowing to use the winter as a time to regain her strength, and rectify her past mistakes, so that she may enter into the coming new year a better and more worthwhile person.

Like all other sabbat rituals, this one ends with song and dance. But the circle moves slowly, and the song is one of a very serious nature.

It's titled "The Sleeping Song," and the words are printed here.

THE SLEEPING SONG

The last year of our life has gone past our recalling,
Except for our feelings of pride and regret;
Of all that was dreadful, just dull, or enthralling,
What should we remember, and how much forget?

Is a Beneficent Being above us?
Or nothing whatever concerned with our fate?
Are there good spirits that care for and love us?
Or none but ourselves to consider our state.

What is the meaning of human existence?
And may we become any more than mere man?
Such vital enigmas demand with insistence,
We seek their solutions however we can.

If reincarnation should ever restore us
to birth beyond reach of a blessing or curse,
And we had our lives once again set before us,
Should we do better, or might we do worse?

Blessed be life beyond all need of dying,
And happy the soul with no burden to shed,
Yet who knows, without any thought of denying,
Whether it's best to be living or dead?

Our questions are answered by living and learning
Whatever comes next on the path we must plod,
Between birth and death, while we have means of earning
The wisdom that makes man become like a God.

Sleep! Deep! Hoping to wake with the Blest.
Dream! Scheme! How we may live for the best.
Our past left behind leaves a future to find,
So now let us thankfully rest.

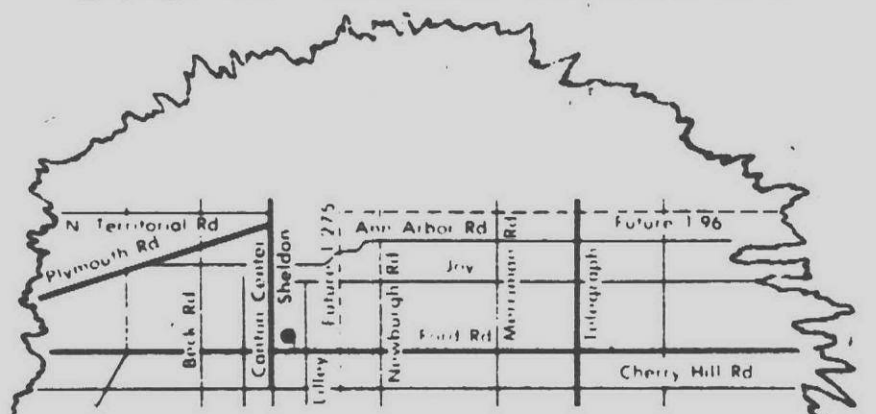

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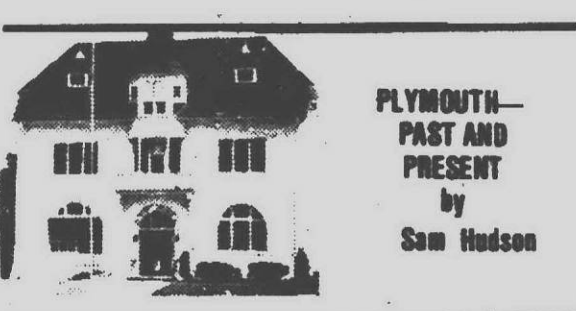
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Mr. Plymouth notes local cost-of-living

Mr. Plymouth continues his reading of the May 2, 1919, Plymouth Mail.

He learns from the ads that Nisley's in Ypsilanti is featuring "Gingham Week," Pinckney's Pharmacy has cream and hard mixture candy at 20 cents a pound, and the use of Goshen Lightning Rods will reduce insurance costs. The Nash Six Touring Car, with valve-in-head motor, is on sale at G.R. Crumby's for \$1,490. Beyer Motor Sales is offering the Ford Touring Car for only \$525.

The Plymouth Milling Company urges farmers to bring in their wheat. Mr. Plymouth wonders whether the farmers who mortgaged their farms to buy more land to meet the food demands of the U.S. and allied armies, will be able to meet their payments now that the war is over and demand has dropped.

Plymouth Elevator Company is in the market for wool and offers to pay 50 cents a pound for it. The firm also offers to sell soft coal for \$7.50 a ton, and stove hard coal for \$11.75 a ton.

JOHN L. GALE, whose general store is at the corner of Main and Pennington, where the bank will later build, reports that he has a new stock of wallpaper every week. He urges local residents to "bring in your eggs and buy wallpaper."

C.G. Draper, local jeweler and optometrist, has some new novels in stock, including Mary Roberts Rinehart's "Amazing Interlude," Zane Grey's "Desert of Wheat," and Edgar Rice Burroughs' "Tarzan."

Roy R. Parrott, the real estate man whose office is on Main Street between Pennington and Gravel Avenue (Frailick), has a seven-room house on a 70 x 150 foot lot on East Ann Arbor Road for sale. It is only seven years old, and the asking price is \$2,700.

Turning the page, Mr. Plymouth reads some saddening news. Richard Wolff, the three-year old son of Earl Wolff, has passed away, a victim of diphtheria. Two other children in the family are afflicted with the same disease but are getting better. Mr. Plymouth's mind goes back to the fall of 1917-18 when so many died as a result of the epidemic of Spanish influenza which swept the nation.

WORLD WAR I has just ended and Plymouth boys are returning from overseas. The Mail mentions the names of those who have arrived home, and carries letters from those still abroad. Lt. Karl P. Miller, at Camp Taylor in Louisville, expects to be discharged in mid-May after service in France. James Hance, who served overseas with the 85th Division, has been honorably discharged. Floyd Eckles, a member of the 64th Infantry, 7th Division, has returned home and is in Ford Hospital. Eckles is still suffering from the effects of being gassed in France.

Harold Douglas, who has just returned, and is in the U.S. Hospital at Hoboken, N.J., writes his mother that the time is near when he will enter civilian life once more. "I know it is going to be very strange to me for a

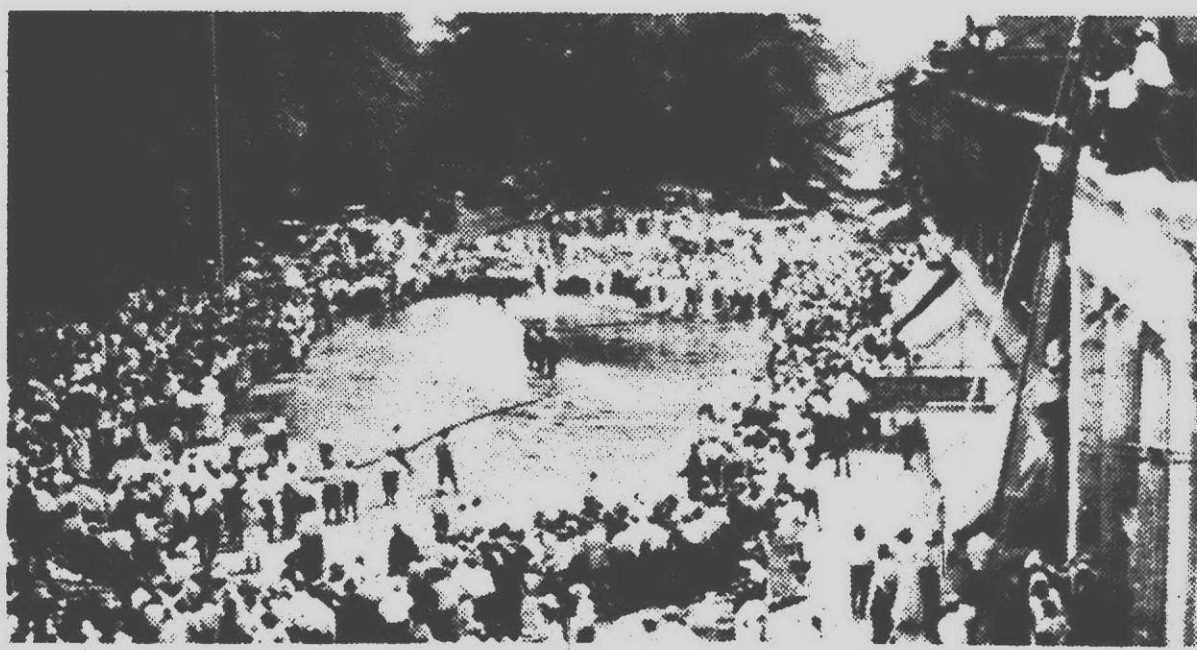

A Detroit firm offers to buy or sell Liberty Bonds at New York Stock Exchange prices. Mr. Plymouth remembers how it was during the peak of the campaign to sell Liberty Bonds. Those who failed to buy the bonds ran the risk of having their homes smeared with yellow paint.

Plymouth is still far from its quota in subscriptions in the Victory Liberty Loan drive which the government began after the Armistice. Only \$55,650 of the goal of \$155,800 has been subscribed.

Supper is ready! Mr. Plymouth folds his Plymouth Mail and walks into the house. His step isn't as light as it was when he arrived home. Reading the paper has dampened his spirits.

It has reminded him of the nation's postwar problems: the soaring prices; the dilemma of the heavily-mortgaged farmers; the question of whether the economy will be able to assimilate the returning soldiers; the continued specter of diphtheria.

He sighs. Life was better in the old days when he was a boy.

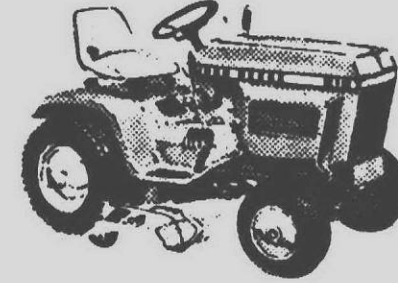

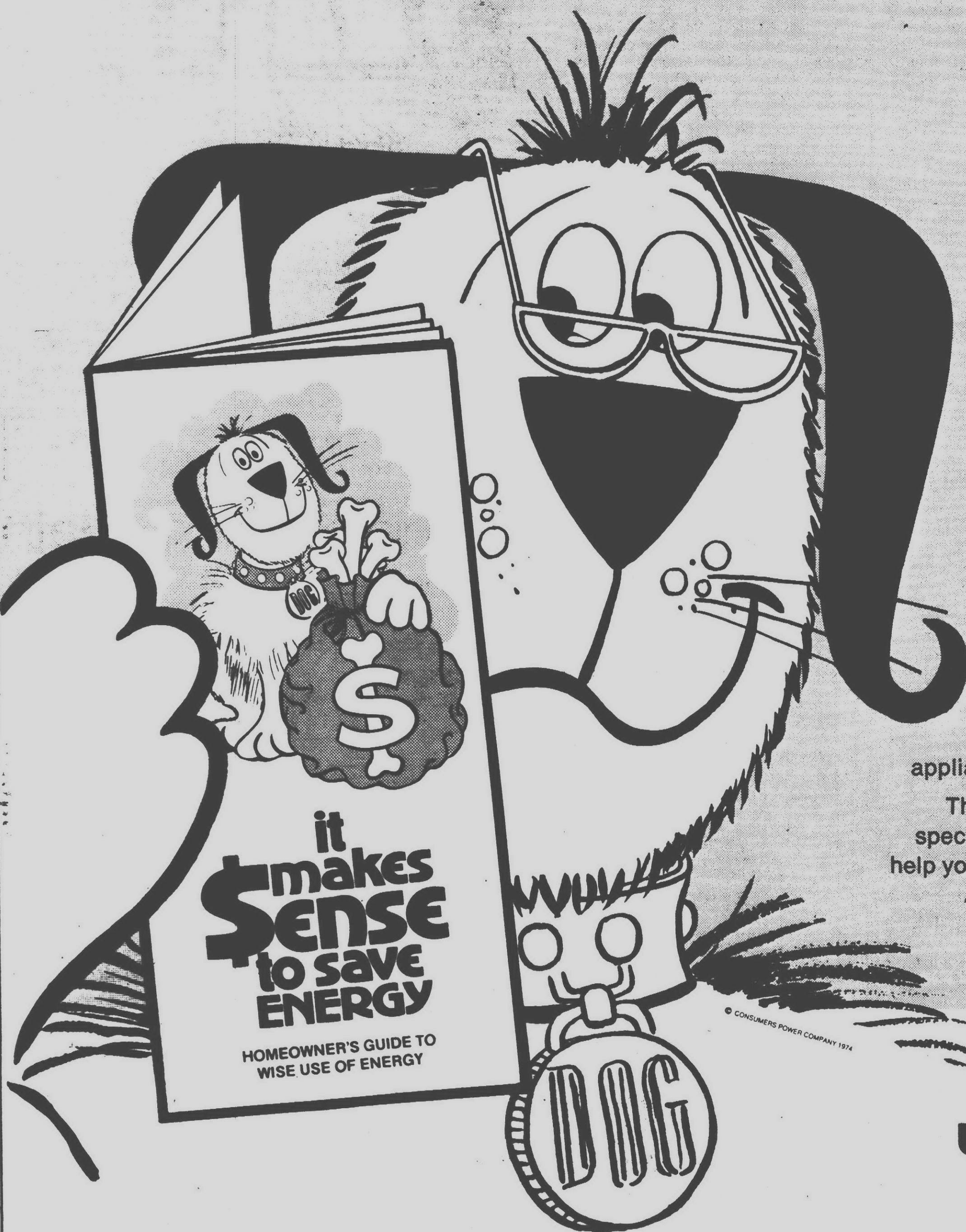

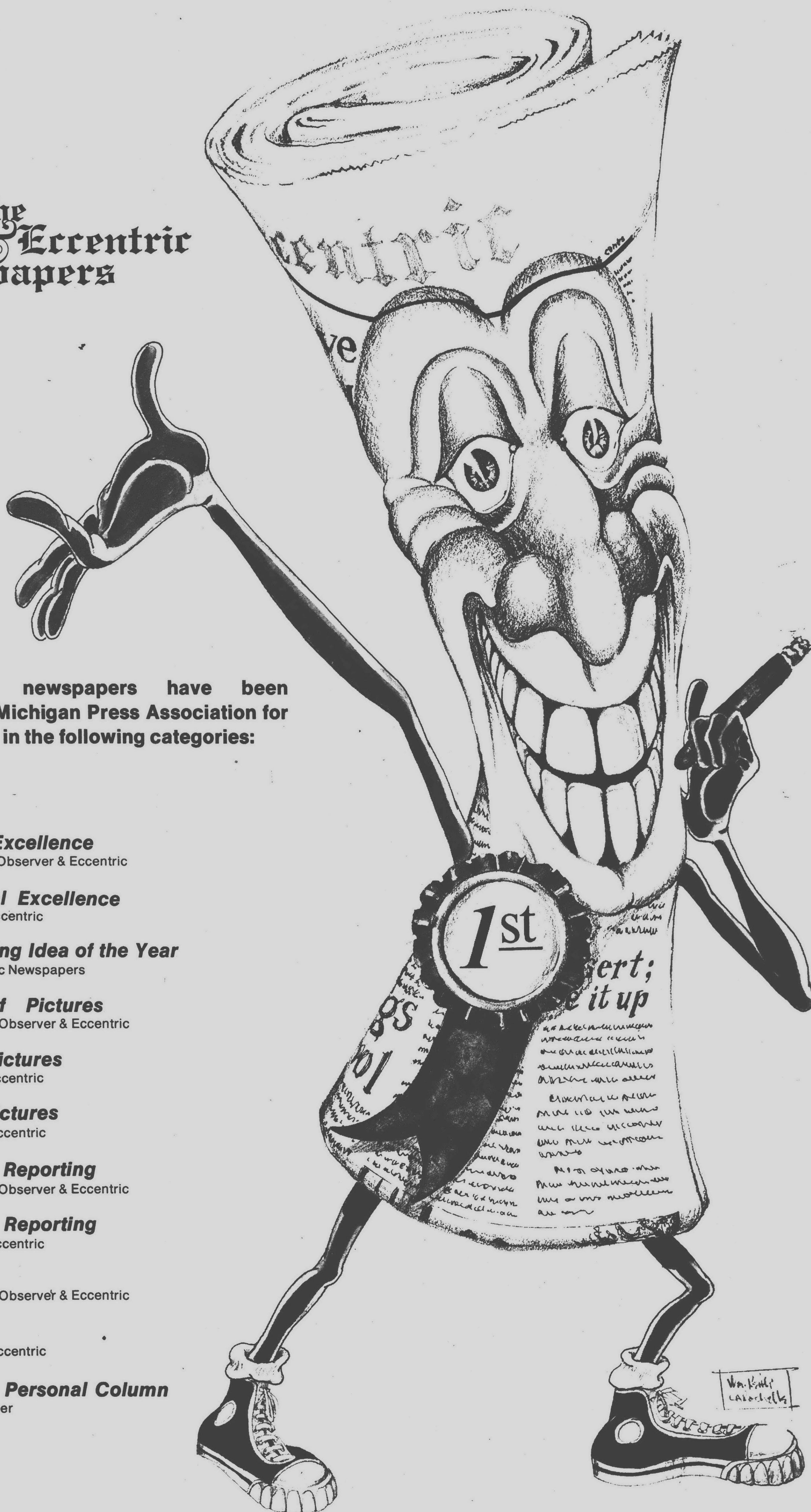

Poles are honored in sculpture exhibit

An exhibit of stainless steel sculptures of prominent native and American-born Poles will inaugurate the bicentennial year celebrations by the Orchard Lake Schools.

The exhibit will open Sunday, Nov. 2, and run through November and December in the Galeria, the fine arts gallery of SS. Cyril and Methodius Seminary, St. Mary's College, and St. Mary's Preparatory, the three academic institutions which comprise the Schools at Orchard Lake and Commerce Roads, six miles west of Pontiac.

The Galeria will be open to the public daily from 1 to 5 p.m. There is no admission charge for the exhibit.

Nov. 2 is also "Polish Day" at Orchard Lake. The Mass will be celebrated in Polish at 1 p.m. in the Shrine-Chapel of Our Lady of Orchard Lake on the campus. In addition to the exhibit in the Galeria, the bookstore of the Center for Polish Studies and Culture will be open.

The exhibit will feature the works of Marian Owczarski, 43, the artist-in-residence of the Orchard Lake Schools since 1972. The Polish sculptor's success with stainless steel as a medium is probably unsurpassed in the last decade. He has exhibited his work in 35 major cities in 11 countries on two continents.

"Everywhere in the world," said Owczarski, "steel is a sign of modernization, a sign of the future."

Currently, in a series of traveling exhibitions in Canada, Owczarski is exhibiting stainless steel sculptures of that country's line of prime ministers.

For the Orchard Lake bicentennial exhibit, Owczarski has selected 15 Poles whose wide range of contributions are significant not only to America, but also to the rest of the world. His sculptures will include:

Rev. Joseph Dabrowski, the founder of the Orchard Lake Schools and of the Order of Felician Nuns in America;

Joseph Conrad (Korzeniowski), a native Pole who became the master of the English novel. His works include "Lord Jim," "Nostromo," "The Heart of Darkness," and "Victory."

Madame Marie Curie-Sklodowska, who with her husband discovered radium and polonium, setting the base for research in nuclear physics and chemistry. She and her husband shared the Nobel Prize for physics in 1903; in 1911, she received the Prize for chemistry;

Casimir Funk, a biochemist credited with discovering life-giving substances for which he coined the word "vitamin" to describe them;

'Dog Day Afternoon'

Robbers steal only trouble

Bank robbers never go to the movies. If they did they would choose another occupation. As every moviegoer knows, the cops always win. It may take hours, it may take years, but the robber always gets it in the end.

The thesis is supported once again in Sidney Lumet's "Dog Day Afternoon," the screen version of a Brooklyn heist that kept New York City television viewers spellbound for one August day in 1972.

The perpetrators of the deed were a mentally-sluggish ex-con named Sal, and Sonny, a harried ex-Vietnam veteran trying to support two wives—one of each sex.

Despite the fact that Sonny, the brains behind the operation, was a former bank employee, the operation was plagued by foulups from the start. Sonny scheduled the robbery for closing time and found most of the money had been sent to a central bank.

WHEN ALL the hostages were finally herded into the vault and the registry burned, getaway was impeded by a legion of NYPD officers surrounding the bank.

In "Dog Day Afternoon," Director Lumet has taken an event with limited action and an even more limited setting and has made a suspenseful



tragi-comedy. He uses humor to increase tension in the potentially explosive situation that never quite explodes but instead ends with a dull misfire. As in his 1974 hit, "Murder on the Orient Express," Lumet has every aspect of the film under control in a well-oiled piece of cinema artistry.

Al Pacino, who worked with Lumet in "Serpico," is the soft-hearted Sonny who jeopardizes his escape by letting the tellers visit the ladies room before being caged in the vault. Holed up the bank surrounded by police for eight hours, Sonny insists on personally paying for the pizzas ordered for the hostages.

Pacino's Sonny has the darting eyes and quick wits of a caged animal, yet succumbs to the drug of his own instant fame. He is a street hero, star of the six o'clock news. His instant status transforms him from a quaking bumbler to a confident man-in-charge. This mistaken confidence plays into

the hands of police and the FBI.

SONNY GETS more trouble than support from his partner Sal (John Cazale), a somber, smoldering gunman who, when asked in which foreign country he would like to take asylum, replies "Wyoming."

If Sal gives Sonny headaches, they are nothing compared to the ones he gets from his two wives, Angie (Susan Peretz) and Leon (Chris Sarandon). It is for the love of the self-indulgent Leon that the robbery is committed in the first place—to get him money for his dreamed-of sex change operation.

The only people really on Sonny's side are his hostages, led by bank manager Sully Boyar and head teller Penny Allen. When the street audience turns hostile at the news of Sonny's bisexuality, the bank personnel continue to stick by him.

As a piece of recent social history, "Dog Day Afternoon" touches on such topics as police brutality, homosexuality, hijacking and media manipulation. Lumet draws no conclusions, satisfying himself with depicting a series of bizarre events through the point of view of the characters involved.

AS A PIECE of entertainment, "Dog Day Afternoon" is exciting, engaging and bitterly funny.

Directing the production will be New Yorker Francis Rizzo, who is also preparing a new English translation of "La Boheme" for MOT.

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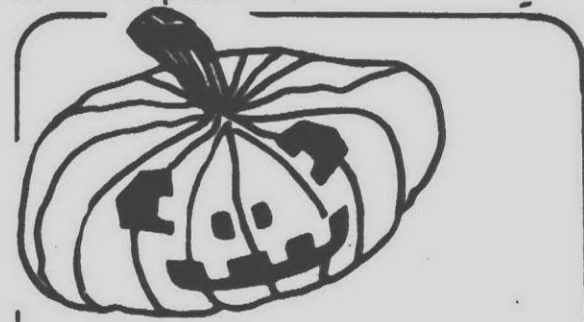

The MOT Chorus will be under the direction of Dr. Raynold Allvin, acting chairman of Oakland University's music department.



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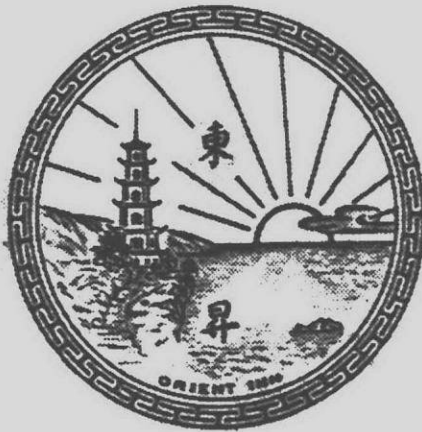
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Robards stars in O'Neill play at Power Center

Thurston falls, 10-3

Franklin wins 3rd title in row

Franklin battled to its third straight outright Northwest Suburban Football League title Saturday afternoon, 10-3, against a rugged Thurston squad which gave the Patriots the battle of their lives before losing.

In fact, Gary Abundis of Thurston had a 47-yard touchdown scamper called back because of a penalty, or the game might have had a different outcome.

But Armand Vigna has a championship in his first year as head coach after being assistant mentor for 10 years. The third consecutive outright NSL football crown has never been accomplished before.

"We are just delighted to take the championship in such a tough league as the Northwest Suburban League," exclaimed a happy Vigna after his charges battled furiously to hold a charged-up Eagle squad from tying the score in the third quarter.

"It was one of the finest high school games I've seen," appraised Thurston coach Don Riehl, "and one of the hardest-hitting battles you could expect. I'm as proud as I can be of my kids and if Gary's long touchdown run hadn't been called back, there's no telling what would have happened."

Thurston, which began the season with high hopes for a good year, showed Franklin it meant business when the Eagles battled the Patriots on even terms throughout the entire game. Franklin totaled 208 yards to Thurston's 201 but the Eagles had a 11-10 first down advantage.

Thurston and Franklin battled back and forth until the Eagles got the ball on the visitors' 47-yard line. Quarterback Roy Pilgrian, who completed eight of 23 passes for 138 yards against a good Patriot secondary, fired a 39-yard pass to John Simons. The pass was batted and grappled for by two Franklin defenders, but Simons pulled the pigskin to his chest for a great catch on Franklin's six yard line.

Three plays lost two yards before coach Riehl called on tackle John Miller and the heavily taped player responded with a 26-yard field goal and a 3-0 Thurston lead after one quarter.

On Thurston's first drive of the second quarter, linebacker Chuck Hench intercepted a Pilgrian pass on Thurston's 39 and returned it to the 29. Seven plays later found the ball on Thurston's eight with a first down. However, a five-yard penalty against

the Eagles gave the Patriots first-and-goal from the four.

But it was here that giant tackles Bob Zichichi, 243 pounds and Richard Graustein, 250 pounds, smashed back Jim Casey twice and Tim Hollandsworth once to force Franklin to settle for Sam Williams' 20-yard tying field goal with 7:46 left in the half.

The large homecoming crowd cheered the Eagles for their fine defensive work all day, and especially on that series.

Jim Casey, who gained 101 yards in 12 carries, got Franklin's game-winner on his team's next possession. Thurston took the kick and moved from its own 35 to Franklin's 35 where Hollandsworth pilfered a pass, then fumbled it, but the Patriots recovered the bouncing ball.

Casey started on a right end sweep,

cut back in and raced 65 yards with the Eagles in hot pursuit. The versatile tailback outran everyone for the TD and Williams again converted for the final 10-3 score.

Neither team scored in the second half which was a bruising, punishing brand of football. Abundis broke loose in the third quarter for a 47-yard scoring romp, but a holding penalty nullified the tying TD and Thurston could only manage eight yards rushing in the final quarter.

"We're very happy to win it," repeated Vigna, "and Thurston has a whale of a football team. Vigna agreed with Riehl that the game was as hard hitting as any this year. He also singled out two-way tackles Bob Picard and Bob Suarez for fine games along with Larry Urben, Chuck

Hench, Casey, Hollandsworth and runner Tom Smith.

Thurston's Riehl was as happy as a coach could be for as team that had played its best in a losing cause. "Whenever Franklin and Thurston get together, it's a real head-knocker," Riehl said. "It could have gone either way and I thought it was one of the finest played high school football games I've ever been connected with. And the kids not only hit hard on both sides, but were good sports as well."

Riehl praised Brian Garber highly, adding: "It was his finest game of the year. Our whole defensive team, which has only given up points in two of our last 16 quarters was great. Gary Abundis is as fine as any back around and the large crowd made the day a very satisfying one. It's too bad both teams couldn't have won."

East girls take cage squeaker

Two of the area's stronger girls basketball teams met Tuesday night, and Garden City East pulled out a last-second 34-33 victory from Livonia Stevenson to raise its record to 11-1.

Jan Moore's squad jumped to a 14-6 first quarter lead and held a 22-18 half-time advantage. Stevenson, mainly on Jeri Isanhart's game-high 18 points, rallied to tie the game 26-all after three periods.

The lead changed hands four times in the final stanza, but with Stevenson leading, 32-30, with 1:30 left, the Panthers came two key field goals for a 34-32 margin. A Stevenson girl was fouled with two seconds left and made the first but missed the second as East won it, 34-33.

EAST HAD earlier defeated the

Spartans in the latter's court, 38-31, when Isanhart was out with appendicitis. Jeannette Fisher again paced the Panthers with 12 points, most of them coming on her outside one-handers. 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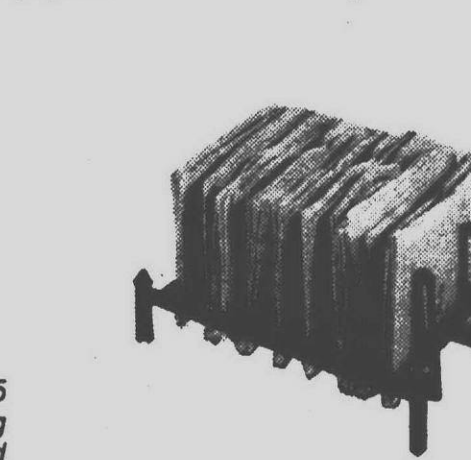
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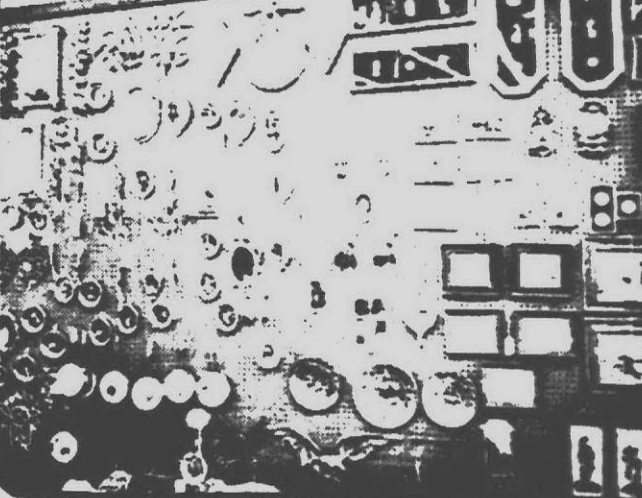
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Salem places eighth in cross-country

"Considering we had a relatively inexperienced team, I feel we had a fairly good season," commented coach Steve Rea at the conclusion of the Plymouth Salem cross country season.

Plymouth Salem's harriers wrapped up their fall schedule last Saturday morning in the state regionals. Salem placed eighth out of 20 teams competing at the Westland John Glenn regional, won by Livonia Churchill.

THE ROCKS best individual performance was turned in by sophomore Scott Kleam. Kleam came across the finish line in fourth place out of the 140 runners in the race.

His time was an impressive 15:58, just nine seconds off the three mile pace. He will be the only runner to represent Salem in the state meet at Grand Blanc Country Club this Saturday.

Co-captains Curt Judd and Walt White finished 19th and 20th respectively, both ran times of 16:27.

Other varsity runners scoring in the event were Jeff Econom in 91st place

with a 17:41 posting, and senior Bill Sonnega dropping to 110th with a 18:13 time.

"We were always in the upper third of the larger invitational meets, which puts our team into perspective with other squads in our area," philosophized coach Rea.

PLYMOUTH CAME away a bit disappointed with its showing at the Suburban Eight league meet. Salem finished sixth out of eight schools in the conference, with Dearborn earning the league title.

Coach Rea contrasted this year's finish with the one of a year ago: "Last fall we finished sixth and ran better than we expected, however, this year we ran worse than we expected and finished sixth. I feel the injury to Walt White hurt our chances greatly for a strong finish. If Walt would've been healthy, I'm sure we'd be in the top four."

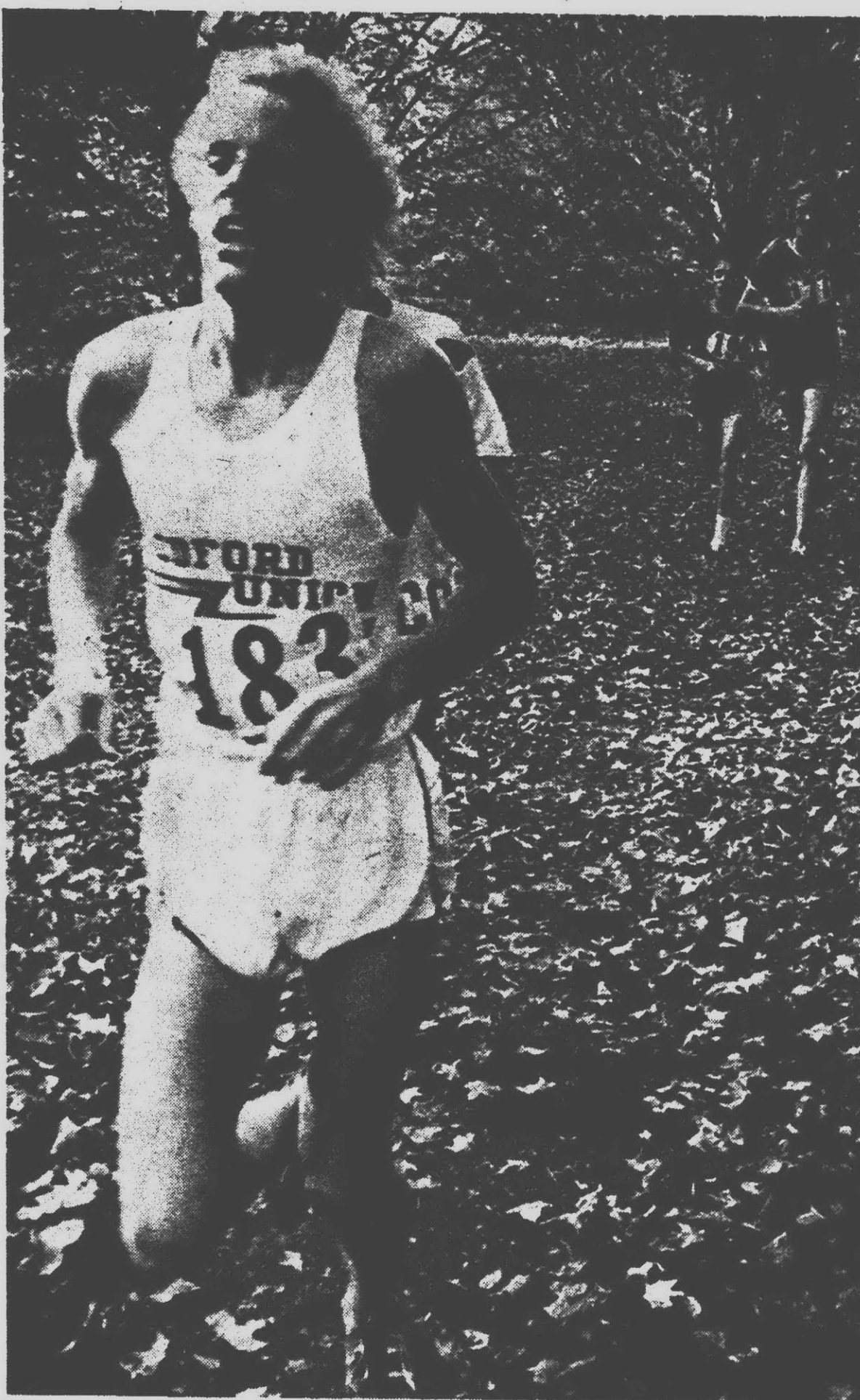
Kleam was Salem's top runner with a time of 16:21, good for seventh place and a spot on the All-League team. Walt White, still ailing from a spiked toe, was the 15th finisher, while Curt Judd was 22nd.

WITH ANOTHER year behind them the Salem cross country team can look to next season with higher hopes and more experience.

"We'll have our top two runners back from this year and will have four more good runners besides," said coach Rea.

"Our biggest task to work on is to recruit more boys for the team, especially freshmen and sophomores. Anytime you have a group of young runners, by the time they have a couple years behind them, you'll have yourself a good team," said Rea.

Salem, earlier in the year, had 24 runners on the squad but saw that number dwindle to 13 by the end of the year. This year's team was comprised of seniors Curt Judd, Bill Sonnega, and Bill Collins. Juniors Walt White, Al Price and Bill Otto. The sophomore contingent was made up of Brad Gigliotti, Dan Lybarger, Jerry St. Pierre and Scott Kleam. Freshmen were Jeff Econom and Bill Kennedy. Rob Bleyerveld was the team's only exchange student. Bleyerveld is a native of the Netherlands.

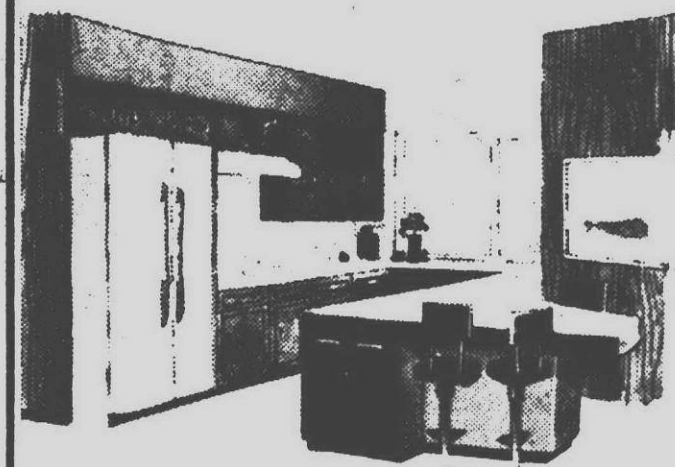
KAY HARMON who carries only a 129 average, did the unusual in the Livonia Ladies Classic when she won two games and series with a grand total of 496-147-643.

Darlene Varley, who carries a 150 overall, topped the Wednesday league with 540, and Marge Van Ness was high in the Tuesday circuit with a 583.

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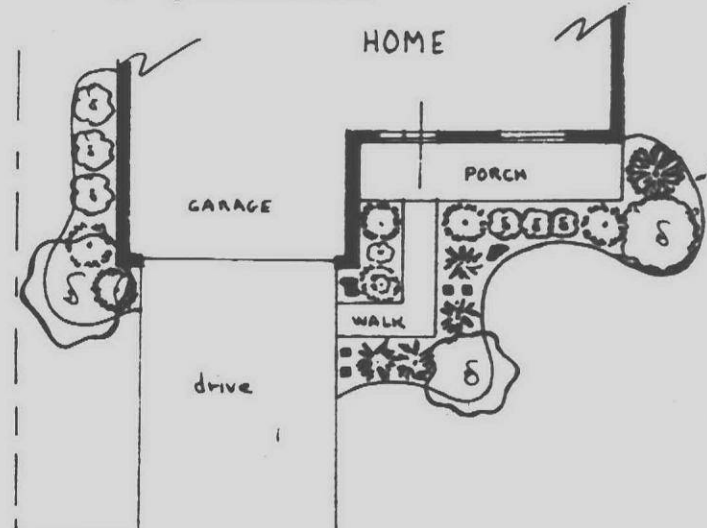
