

# City gets paving bill but lacks money to pay

The new Plymouth City Commission, to be sworn in tonight (Monday), will get its baptism under fire in the next few weeks when a decision must be made on whether to proceed with a project to widen two major intersections.

There isn't the money available in the city's coffers at present to finance either or both of the projects and there is great confusion about whether

the city is committed to the second intersection widening. Nobody yet has come up with answers to explain how the city got into the position of apparently agreeing to the projects, but not having any plans to finance them on the record.

In 1971, Plymouth asked for Wayne County's participation to widen the intersection of Mill and Main Streets. A few months later an agreement was

signed with the county which also included the widening of the Mill and Ann Arbor Trail intersection.

The records in 1975 don't offer any explanation of how Ann Arbor Trail and Mill got added to the project, and don't give any hints about how the city expected to finance this second project.

**THE DILEMMA** began to unravel when the city received a bill—due in

30 days—from the Wayne County Road Commission for \$231,436.

The bill represents the expense of acquiring right-of-way, through condemnation proceedings, of property along Mill and Main, and Ann Arbor Trail and Mill.

This was the first hint for the present city commission that the county was proceeding with the widening of

Ann Arbor Trail and Mill at the C&O tracks.

The bill was especially disturbing because the city only has \$114,590 in its treasury earmarked for the Mill-Main intersection, leaving a shortage of almost \$117,000 to pay the bill.

In 1971, when the commission voted to participate in the widening of Mill-Main, the city sold bonds of \$94,000 for that single project. The bonds have been on deposit collecting interest and now represent \$114,590.

A SEARCH of the minutes indicates that on Feb. 1, 1971, the city commission passed a bonding resolution to acquire right-of-way to widen and improve turning lanes at Main-Mill. No mention is made of Ann Arbor Trail-Mill in that resolution.

The bonding resolution estimated the Main-Mill project cost at \$375,000. It called for bond sales to raise \$94,000 for the city's share with the balance expected to come from the county and from federal TOPICS highway funds.

Members of the city commission in 1971 were then Mayor James McKeon, James Jabara, Harold Guenther, Robert Sincok, Arch Vallier, Don Bidwell and Bill Silvis. After tonight, none of these members will be on the commission with Guenther and Sincok stepping down and the others having already departed. The city manager then was Norm Gaffney.

What is puzzling to the present commission is that three months after the bonding resolution was passed, Mayor McKeon and City Clerk Eugene S. Slider signed an agreement with the county on May 27, 1971, which included acquiring right-of-way at both intersections, Main-Mill and Ann Arbor Trail-Mill.

A search of the minutes between February and May indicates the commission didn't pass any subsequent resolutions asking for the widening of Ann Arbor Trail and Mill. The best explanation, at this point, is that commissioners apparently discussed im-

proving the second intersection in private meetings and instructed the clerk and mayor to sign. But there is no record to indicate this.

The agreement signed with the county in February, 1971, also indicates the city's share would be \$193,000—quite a difference from the \$94,000 the city saw as its share in the bonding resolution three months earlier.

**CITY MANAGER** Fred Yockey is trying to unravel the pieces and advise the commission on what the next best step is for the city.

Yockey has talked with Sincok, Guenther, Jabara and former City Engineer Tom Waffan and none of them have any recollection of any financial discussion or plan for Ann Arbor Trail and Main.

The county has acquired the right-of-way already under the quick-take statute. Yockey explains, which has paid for the property and acquired the deeds. The final payments, however, won't be settled until condemnation proceedings end in court.

"Because of this," Yockey adds, "we won't know the actual cost of acquiring right-of-way until the courts grant the final awards. With the value of land going up, the final cost of acquisition could be higher than the \$241,426."

The city is presently asking the road commission whether it can back out of the Ann Arbor Trail-Mill project. If the Wayne County Road Commission cannot get out because it already owns the land, the city wants to know if Plymouth can back out of the project.

Yockey also is trying to determine what the savings would be if the city could get out of Ann Arbor Trail-Mill widening. He presently estimates a savings of about \$50,000.

"Everybody agrees that Main and Mill is a dangerous intersection and should be improved. But, even if we just improve this one intersection, the

# Penn Theater is picketed by 4 Nazi-uniformed men

A group of four young men dressed in Nazi military uniforms were demonstrating at the Penn Theater in Plymouth Saturday afternoon against the Billy Graham film being shown—"The Hiding Place."

All four, from Livonia, are forming a National Socialist (Nazi) White Peoples Party in the suburbs as a measure to counteract busing to achieve racial integration.

A spokesman for the group said they were protesting the movie because it promoted hate against National Socialists, promulgated what the group sees as a "myth" that six million Jews were killed by the Nazis, and overlooked war crimes committed by the U.S. and its allies.

**ERIC STEELE** of Livonia, a leader of the Livonia-based NSWPP group, said his organization has moved to the suburbs here and is gaining membership because of the busing issue.

"We object to 'The Hiding Place' because World War II happened more than 40 years ago. The United States, with its atom bomb, has wiped out more people than the National Socialists in Germany ever did. This movie is a distortion and preaches hate against National Socialists.

"We don't believe six million Jews were killed by the Nazis in World War II—that's a myth. We don't advocate killing Jews or blacks. But we do object to the falsehoods in this film."

The film, a Billy Graham production, tells about the ordeal of a Christian family attempting to spread Christianity and aid Jews while living in Holland during the war.

The movie has attracted a number of area church groups to the Penn Theater during its showing. In fact, on the day of the demonstration, a bus from the Plymouth Road Baptist Chapel was parked behind the Penn Theater on Penniman near Main Street in Plymouth.

The movie also is being shown at the Terrace Theater in Livonia.

Margaret Wilson, owner of the Penn, was at the theater at 2:30 p.m. Saturday while the demonstration was in progress. She went outside briefly to talk with a Plymouth police officer, chatted with some youngsters on the sidewalk, and went back inside.

Plymouth police squad cars patrolled past the theater, keeping a close watch. One patrol car stopped while this reporter was there, and an officer encouraged youngsters to clear the sidewalk. Steele commented that

police departments have been very cooperative with his group because he has assured them of peaceful demonstrations.

**ANOTHER PURPOSE** for the demonstration, Steele said, was to protest the imprisonment of Rudolf Hess.

"The only thing Hess ever did was to try and stop the war and the U.S. imprisoned him. He's now 82-years-old, still in jail, and in solitary confinement. That's inhumane.

"America and the Allies are willing to release Hess because he is an old man now, but the Soviet Union objects. So in the spirit of detente, the U.S. is refusing to release Hess.

"Why hasn't anyone made a movie about what the communists did in Korea or Vietnam? A couple of our members picketing today served in the Vietnam War.

**STEELE WOULDN'T** give the names of the other three marchers because it is the NSWPP's policy only to release names of its leaders.

He stressed NSWPP members don't hate Jews or blacks, but believe other groups shouldn't get angry because they are organizing to protect "white power."

Steele said the party now is planning to obtain legal power by seeking public office and plans to run candidates for the Livonia Board of Education this June. The group also is seeking permission to hold a public rally at Ford Field in Livonia.

**THE SIGNS** included the slogan "White Power" and a message urging passers-by to "Ignore anti-NS Hate Films."

While marching in front of the Penn, the demonstrators were passing out literature urging "Freedom for Rudolf Hess."

The leaflets contained a policy statement which read: "The National Socialist White Peoples Party is made up of Americans who believe in America and the White race, like most Americans do. And, we are willing to stand up and fight for our nation and race to protect and advance them. We believe in the greatness of our country and its traditions. We believe that America should be run for decent White folks, not for Black pressure groups or Communist traitors."

The leaflet carried a 1973 copyright obtained by the George Lincoln Rockwell Party Incorporated. Rockwell, now dead, was founder and leader of the American Nazi Party.

# Government balks on bottle control

"It's not a dead issue. I believe in it," said Marda Benson, chairperson of the Intergovernmental Committee. This was in spite of an apparent balking on the part of local governments to support the committee's push to ban non-returnable bottles.

None of the areas in the Plymouth Community School District represented by the intergovernmental unit is exactly enthusiastic about the project.

Richard Gornick, Plymouth Township trustee, told the committee his board agreed "a local ordinance is not the way to go," and turned down the suggestion by a 5-2 vote. He added, "They can't enforce what they have on the books now."

A choice is available in Plymouth Township according to Gornick. Wrigley's offers beverages in both returnable and non-returnable bottles.

**RICHARD INNES** said Superior Township was not interested in a local ordinance but favored joint support for a state ban.

Norbert Battermann, reporting for the City of Plymouth, said the carry-over commission following last week's general election showed a 2-2 split on the issue.

Battermann said City Attorney Charles Lowe had reviewed the legal aspects of a local ordinance and found there could be no control over bottles containing alcoholic beverages. He said, at this point, he could not predict how the new city commission would respond to the proposal.

Harvey Barkley said discussion by Salem Township trustees resulted in the decision that the ordinance should be countywide rather than local.

Canton Township was not represented at the regular meeting. Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein has shown support for the ban.

Committee members noted recent newspaper articles which indicated a strong lobby was under way by the bottling and beverage companies to maintain the status quo in the industry.

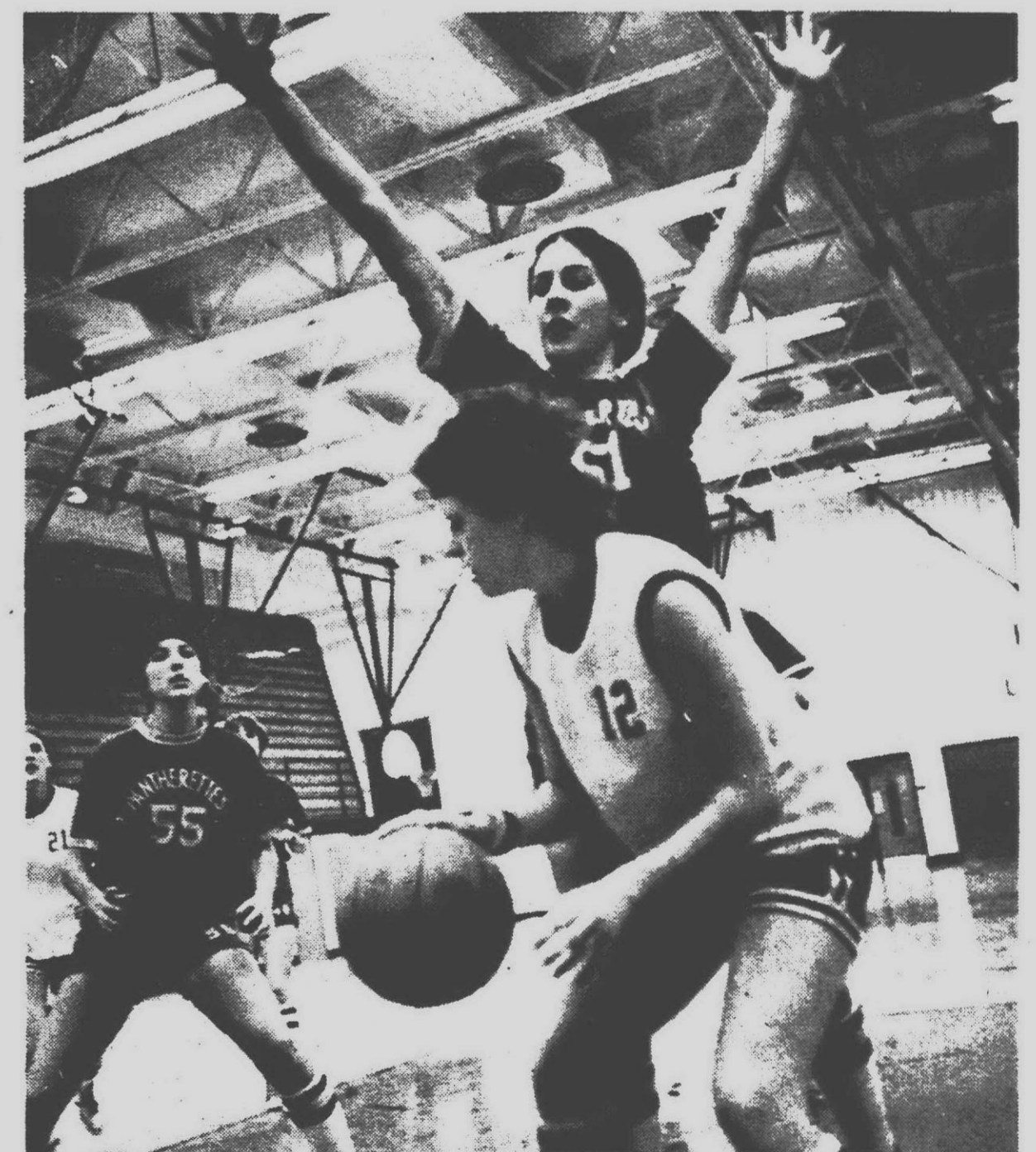

# Young manager accepts awesome challenge

A man who just 10 years ago was busing dishes in a hotel in Clearwater, Fla., is today general manager of an \$8 million complex.

While this may not be an unusual situation in many instances, it is quite

an accomplishment in the case of Don Harrill, who is only 25 years old.

HARRILL WAS recently named general manager of the Plymouth Hilton Hotel, a 195-room facility located on Northville Road in Plymouth township.

His career started in 1965 while attending high school.

Harrill, through his older brother, got a job with the Jack Tar Hotel, busing and washing dishes after school.

"This really got me interested in the business, gave me some on-the-job training," he said.

Upon graduation from high school, Harrill enrolled in a hotel-motel management course at St. Petersburg Junior College.

In 1970 he became assistant manager of Hilton Inn South in Orlando, Fla. Three months later he was named manager.

Remaining in the Hilton chain, Harrill, in 1972, was named resident manager of the St. Petersburg Hilton,

which is owned by the same persons who own the Hilton Inn at Detroit's Metropolitan Airport.

Harrill was appointed general manager of the Hilton at Metropolitan Airport in June, 1974, where he remained until given his present position last June.

A resident of Florida 23 years, where his parents still live, Harrill met and married his wife, Judy in January, 1972. The couple are expecting their first child in a few months.

ALTHOUGH THE hotel business has occupied 10 years of his life, Harrill could have been a mechanic.

"I helped my father repair some engines on his boats while still a kid, but somehow the hotel business got into my blood," he smiled.

Harrill's responsibilities as general manager include, the guest rooms, two restaurants, health club facilities and a banquet area accommodating up to 1,100 persons. Within three weeks, the hotel's Jolly Miller restaurant and lounge will be open for business, Harrill added.

Moving into this job before the Plymouth Hilton was ready to open put an added burden on the new general manager.

"There were times when we were really worried about whether or not we would be ready for our target date of Oct. 31," Harrill said. "Shipments of equipment, including the carpeting, were slow in arriving, but somehow it all fell into place."

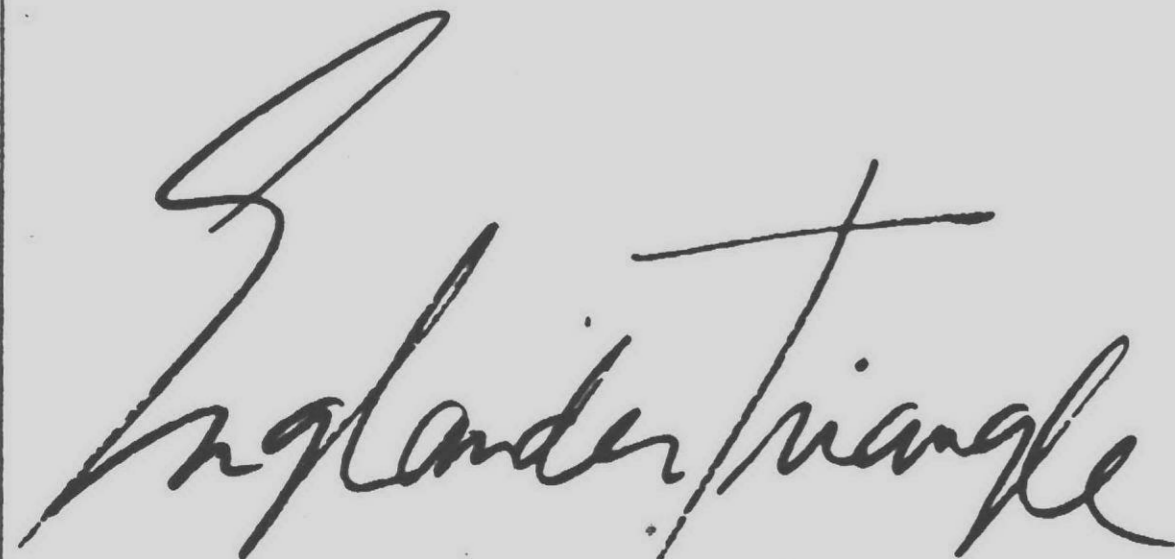

# How residents feel about Canton identity

What's in a name and mailing address?

Not much, say most Canton residents surveyed by the Observer & Eccentric, who have adopted a "don't care" attitude toward a postal decision giving the township its own zip code and mailing address.

But, to other residents, the municipal name appearing on checks and magazine subscriptions is an important feature of community life.

Some prefer mail stamped "Canton Township," giving their hometown an identity of its own. Others, particularly those living within the Plymouth postal area, wish to maintain an identity with their northern neighbor.

BEGINNING in January or February, postal authorities will stamp Canton mail, now addressed to Plymouth, Belleville, Ypsilanti or Wayne, with

the township's own zip code and municipal mailing address.

Canton officials must decide on a name for mailing to Joseph J. Loukotka, district director of the U.S. Postal Services' customer service division.

Although township officials herald the zip code as a victory for the township, some fear the name change will upset some of Canton's residents who have an allegiance over the years to Plymouth, Wayne, Belleville or Ypsilanti.

"I'm an optimist by nature," said Clerk John Flodin, "and, hopefully, there'll be a solution acceptable to everyone in the township."

"But, whether we like it or not, there is a division in the township with alliances to different communities. Some feel they're part of Plymouth and want to stay that way. Others feel they're part of Wayne, Belleville or Ypsilanti."

ABOUT 70 per cent of Canton's residents live within the northern segment of the township, now served by the Plymouth Post Office, Flodin estimates. The remainder are served by Wayne or Belleville postal authorities, with a small percentage served by the Ypsilanti post.

"Plymouth" now appears on the mail of Canton resident Helen Shelanskey on the southern side of Joy Road. Mrs. Shelanskey is among residents who favor the zip code's status quo.

"I'd rather stay with Plymouth," said Mrs. Shelanskey. "I don't want to be a Cantonite. We live just outside Plymouth, and we feel very strong ties to that community."

"When we moved into this house, we were told we'd have a Plymouth address," Mrs. Shelanskey said. "We looked at houses on both sides of Joy Road. We probably would have moved into the other house in Plymouth

Township if we had known about this."

Judith Casemore, 41623 Bedford, lives within the Plymouth postal area and expressed similar views.

"I would just as soon stay with Plymouth," Miss Casemore said. "You tell people you live in Canton, and they say, 'Where's that?' I think there's more prestige in Plymouth rather than the unknown area of Canton."

ACCORDING to views of township officials and many Canton residents, a township zip code and mailing address would publicize the community and glue a Canton identity on the four sections of the township.

One member of that camp is Victoria Morgan of 42966 Arlington, a resident of the Plymouth postal area.

"I'm 100 per cent for it," Mrs. Morgan emphasized. "Plymouth is Plymouth, and Canton is Canton. I

think it's about time they created an identity for us."

Herb Wilson of 1334 Lotz feels a change in his mailing address from Wayne to Canton Township is inevitable.

"They're going to do it eventually, the way Canton's growing. I don't object as long as it won't interfere with the mail."

Pat Prater of 5010 Belleville Road feels a change in her address from Belleville to Canton will ease some confusion over the location of her home. Persons often search for her home on the other end of Belleville Road because of her Belleville address.

"I'm used to Belleville, but a change might eliminate some of the confusion," she said. "It really wouldn't make too much difference to me, but, if they change it to Canton, that's fine."

Other residents object to the inconvenience involved in a mailing address change. Addresses on credit cards, checking accounts, magazine

subscriptions and friends' Christmas card lists will have to be changed.

"We're very transient," said Gretchen Hutchinson of 6118 New England Lane. "The hassle of changing addresses after moving a year ago is not pleasant at all."

But, according to Loukotka, Canton residents could take up to two years to change their mailing addresses, before action is taken against postal procrastinators. About two years are needed to list new zip codes in the national zip code directory, he explained.

THE MAJORITY of residents questioned by the Observer & Eccentric adopted a "don't care" attitude.

Earl Dasher, who lives at 2306 Hanman in the Wayne postal area and across the road from Westland, summed up the views of those residents.

"It doesn't make much difference to me," Dasher said of the mailing switches. "As long as I get my mail, I really don't care."

## Students continue archeological dig

Archeologists are sifting through the earth near East Middle School these days in quest of "ancient" remains from the mid-20th century.

Equipped with shovels and screens for sifting, the workers are methodically covering the site of a recently demolished home and recording their treasures on charts in grams.

The "archeologists," fifth grade students in Carol Welsh's class at Allen Elementary School, are visiting the archeological site in shifts as part of their study of ancient civilizations.

WITH WORK underway for about two weeks now, failure to uncover a skeleton of Neanderthal man or other ancient remains has not discouraged the students a bit.

After all, they note, their treasures now include a 1941 penny and a bracelet from a mid-century jewelry box.

The project, according to Ms. Welsh, is giving pupils a peek at methods of archeological research and stimulating their interest in school.

"They're interested," she said with a sweeping gesture toward a shelf of archeological books. "They've read all these books they normally wouldn't have. I think if you get them interested, they'll learn anything."

Ms. Welsh credits fifth grader David Schelling with conception of the archeological dig idea. David, she ex-

plained, discovered a fish fossil, formed 600 million years ago, on the school playground one day.

"I found the fossil, and my friend and I looked it up to see what it was," David explained. "I asked Ms. Welsh if we could get permission to do a dig. You find things that tell about the past, and you can know what happened millions of years ago."

David's idea caught like fire among fifth graders in Ms. Welsh's classroom. They decided on the site near East Middle School where a house had recently stood. The site, pupils reasoned, should contain artifacts used by residents of the house.

STUDENTS, WHO have already dug 10 to 50 inches into the ground, have so far uncovered two pennies from the 1940s, a bracelet, a ring, a remnant from a garage and numerous fossils.

"My partner and I were digging and found a fossil," confided fifth grader Craig Hancock with excitement. "We like going out there. Being an archeologist would be fun. If you were lucky, you could discover remains of a city or a bone or something."

Cindy McSurely cited some disappointment in her classmates' findings.

"I like to dig," she said, "but I was hoping to find Hoffa or something."

## Aesop visits Fiegel School

"My stories aren't really stories though," he said. "They're fables. Fables are a way of telling stories, so you can learn a lesson."

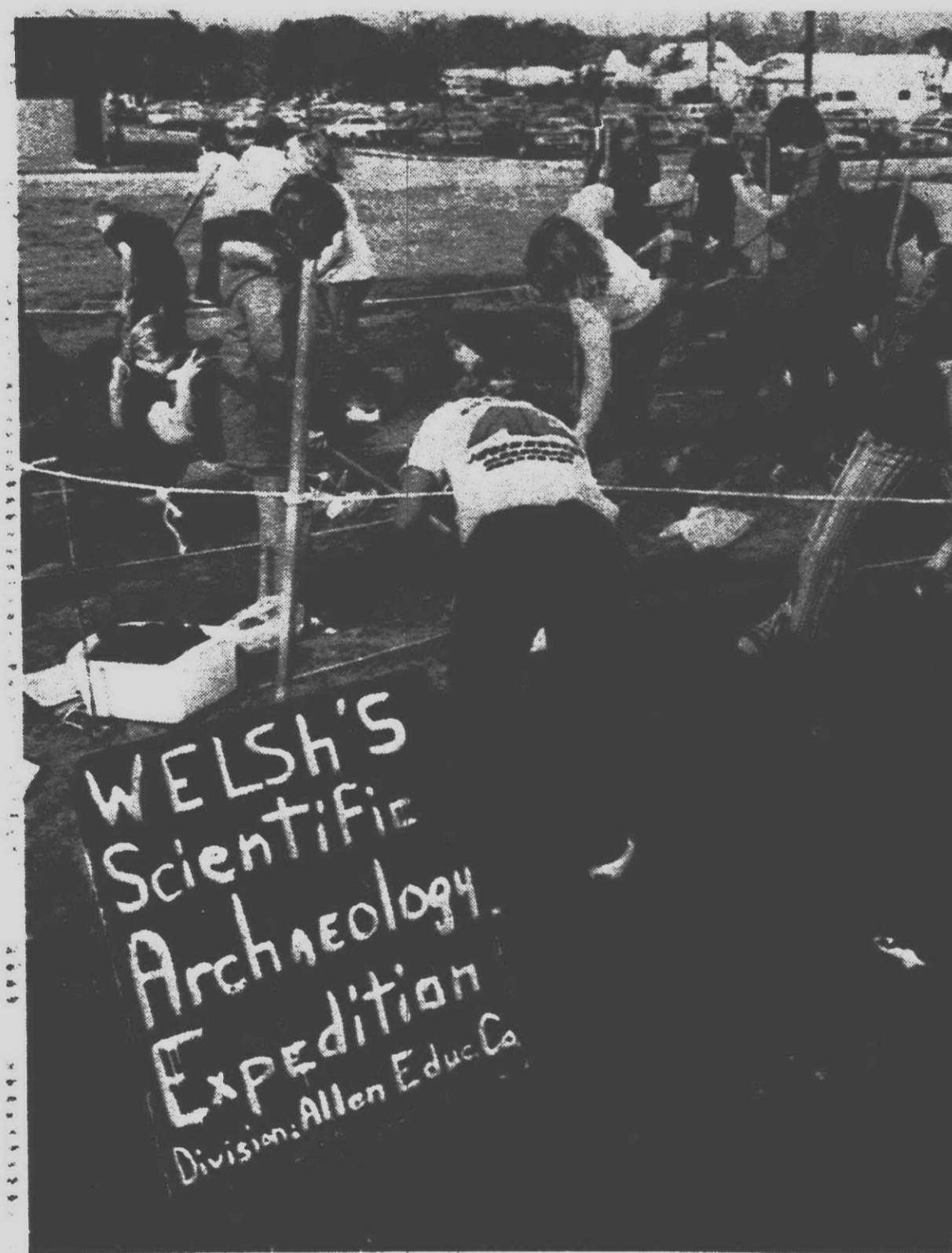
WITH THAT a flaxen-haired farm girl appeared on stage with a basket of eggs in hand and cited the dresses and hats she'd buy with the funds from hatched chicks. But a slip, a fall and a batch of broken eggs ruined the well-planned scheme.

"I guess Patty has learned a good lesson—you don't count your chicks before they're hatched," said Mr. Aesop over the farm girl's wails. "I wrote that fable more than 2,500 years ago, and it's still strong today."

More furry, beloved animals appeared on the well-lighted stage, ensuring the attention of students for the duration of the show.

"I liked the slow turtle, because he won," said first grader Jerry Jewett. Other students chimed in. "I liked the lion." "I liked the rabbit. I liked the whole thing."

The performances, a program from the Detroit Youtheatre Show on the Road of the Detroit Institute of Arts, was sponsored by the PCAC and a grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts.

city still must sell bonds to come up with the necessary money."

If the city undertakes both projects, the estimated cost for right-of-way and construction is estimated to be in excess of \$300,000. If only Main and Mill is improved, the project cost is expected to be about \$250,000.

"Possibly the city commission might decide to do both, but in either case we must still issue bonds. I assume the city in 1971 was planning on some kind of federal assistance, but the records don't indicate what."

Yockey adds although the bill is due in 30 days he is sure the county will extend the due-date deadline. For one thing, in 1971 the county agreed to bill the city quarterly, but failed to do so and instead sent one lump bill this month.

The other factor is that, should the city sell bonds, it would take three to four months to go through the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission to gain approval for the bond sale.

Yockey says he is certain there aren't any shady deals that have been made, or any sinister plots involved. "It's just a case where commitments were made and now, four years later, there's nothing in the records to indicate where the money would come for those commitments."

City Attorney Charles Lowe is studying the agreement to see if the city can legally get out. One theory he is investigating is that the agreement isn't valid if the commission didn't pass a resolution in public authorizing the widening of Ann Arbor Trail-Mill.

## Students learn about research opportunities

Students will get a peek at the future when General Motors national assembly programs, Previews of Progress, appears today (Monday) at Plymouth Canton High and Pioneer Middle School. The non-commercial show "seeks to inspire more student interest in science, engineering, and related technical and vocational careers to provide the trained talent America needs to keep pace with the promise of the future," explains GM President Elliott M. Estes. Previews of Progress demonstrations depict work being done today in America's research laboratories and point out the contributions of research to modern living. A two-man team narrates the live show in non-technical language.

MORE THAN 30 million students and adults in the U.S. have seen Previews since 1946. Millions more have seen the show in Canada and 12 foreign countries, including special presentations made overseas at the request of the U.S. Department of Commerce. Featured is explanation and demonstration of a catalytic converter, a device used to reduce automobile related exhaust pollutants. Based on extensive research and engineering, GM believes the catalytic converter is the best choice of alternatives at this time for meeting federal requirements because it reduces emissions of pollutants while also permitting improvements in fuel economy and driveability of automobiles.

ANOTHER DEMONSTRATION uses a laser beam to translate the sounds we hear into visual patterns of light. In all, students will see nine live examples of research-in-action. Previews has received acclaim from educators and civic organizations for its efforts in encouraging more student interest in science, engineering, and related careers. The program originated in May of 1937 to combat the widespread feeling then that continuing technological advancement was limited.

## Drop-out figures released

During the 1973-74 school year, 7.75 per cent of the students in grades nine to 12 in Plymouth Community School District dropped out of school. That finding was reported in a study released last week by the Michigan Department of Education which annually publishes a statistical report on dropouts from public high schools in Michigan. The percentage at the Centennial Educational Park includes those students who dropped out at the end of the school year by not enrolling again in September, 1974.

IN PLYMOUTH, most of the dropouts were in the senior year (92) with 80 dropping out in their junior year,

50 in their sophomore year, and none in their freshman year. Divided by sex, 62 male and 30 female seniors dropped out, 40 male and 40 female juniors, 30 male and 20 female sophomores. The 7.75 per cent drop-out rate at the CEP in Plymouth compares as follows to these districts: Allen Park, 3.9 per cent; Cherry Hill, 10.45 per cent; Dearborn, 5.5 per cent; Detroit, 14.8 per cent; Melvindale, 7.4 per cent; Garden City, 7 per cent; Grosse Pointe, 1.05 per cent; Highland Park, 19.9 per cent; Lincoln Park, 7.6 per cent; Livonia, 3.05; Redford Union, 8.2 per cent; South Redford, 2.61 per cent; River Rouge, 12.3 per cent; Wayne-Westland, 5.9 per cent; Crest-

wood, 7.8 per cent; Northville, 3.05 per cent; and Van Buren, 9.7 per cent. THE STATE defines dropouts as all students removed from the school membership before graduation for any reason other than cases such as transfers to other schools, student deaths, illness or injury affecting attendance through the end of school. The drop-out rate was obtained by dividing the total drop-out figures for grades nine to 12 by the total membership and multiplying by 100 to obtain the per cent. The dropout numbers are reported at the grade level in which the student was enrolled at the time the drop out occurred.

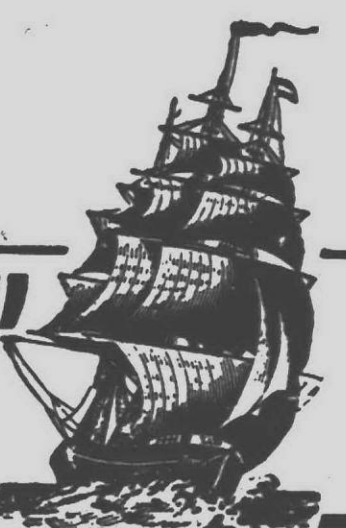

# East struggles past West in two overtimes

Garden City East continued its jinx over crosstown rival West Friday night as the Panthers took a pulse-pounding, 33-27, victory in two overtimes before a packed East High stadium crowd.

It was the ninth consecutive year of frustration for the Tigers as East coach Gary Humphrey hasn't lost to West in that span of time, winning eight and tying one.

Defensive halfback Jim Riley made the game-breaking play in the second overtime as he picked off Tom Poole's pass on his own five yard line and raced down the left sidelines 95 yards with the deciding touchdown to give East a 5-3-1 record. West finished 5-4.

The annual intra-city rivalry, which is one of the most emotional in the area, brought a overflow crowd to witness the exciting game which saw East's Panthers dominate the first half.

With the injured quarterback Wally Krol back in action, East once again looked like it had earlier in the year. The two teams sparred back and forth for field position in the first quarter, but the Panthers, under the guidance of Krol, moved 68 yards in 11 yards to take a 7-0 lead.

Fullback Bob Hudson, who also caught key passes while playing tight end, bulled his way through several tacklers for an eight-yard touchdown and Rob Taraskavage added the point.

Terry Bradley, who scored two

touchdowns, carried the first three West plays and netted 10 yards and a first down, the only one West picked up in the first quarter. However, after East scored its first TD, John Stupyra, who played a tremendous game for West, gathered in the ensuing kickoff on his 20 yard line and raced up the middle 80 yards for a touchdown and his extra point tied it at 7-all.

Mike Thomas, who gained 102 yards in 27 carries, his finest performance of the year, set up Krol's one-yard TD as East led at half, 13-7.

Thomas continued his fine play and fullback Keith Siczkowski, who scampered 78 yards in 16 rushes, ran the final 18 yards to put East ahead, 20-7, when Taraskavage added the PAT.

Just when things looked bleak for West, Poole came out firing and hit end Bob Samples with an 18-yard first-down pass. Then Poole lofted a 40-yard aerial that Bradley pulled in on the sidelines and he raced all the way to the Panther four.

Bradley knifed off guard four yards on the next play and Stupyra added the point after as East led, 20-14.

After West stopped East, Poole generated a 62-yard drive in 10 plays to tie the game at 20-20. First he zeroed in on John Stupyra, whose brother Dale also played a good game in the secondary, with a 24-yard pass.

Then Poole pitched 15 yards to end Shawn Dunnigan for another first down. Samples grabbed an eight-yard pass in the left corner of the endzone for the tying touchdown but Stupyra's

extra point attempt was wide.

East threatened in the fourth quarter but a 40-yard field goal attempt with five seconds left was no good.

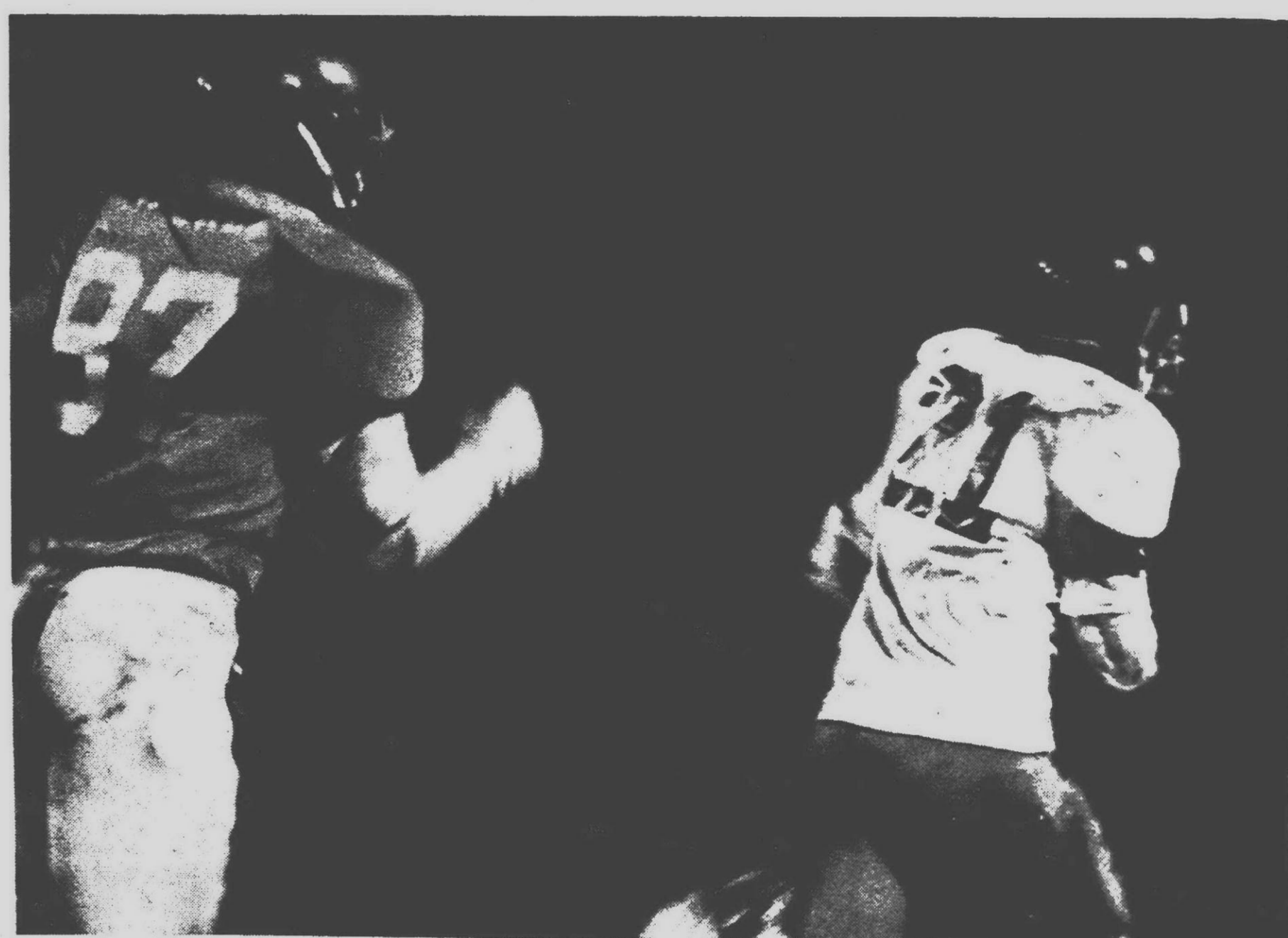
In the first overtime period, West won the toss and went on defense. Krol promptly fired a "look-in" pass to lanky 6-foot-4 end Greg Emery for a touchdown on the first play and the kick was good as the crowd roared.

West, trailing 27-20, got a first down on the five when an East defender interfered with Bradley on a pass pattern. Bradley then carried three straight times, lunging the final yard for the score and Stupyra knotted it, 27-27.

IN THE SECOND OVERTIME, West went first and Bradley was again pushed on a pass pattern for a first down at the four. Bradley ran around his left end into the endzone on the next play, but two West players were in motion and five yards were marked off against the Tigers.

That set the stage for Jim Riley to become the final hero of a game that had many heroes on both sides. On third-and-nine, Riley raced in, picked off Poole's pass and raced 95 gleeful yards for the deciding TD which kept the nine-year unbeaten streak alive.

"I thought Krol played an outstanding game as did Poole and Bradley," said Humphrey. "It was a whale of a game and could have gone either way. West gave an all-out effort but I'm naturally happy for our boys who worked so hard to pull out the victory."

However, Inkster Cherry Hill,

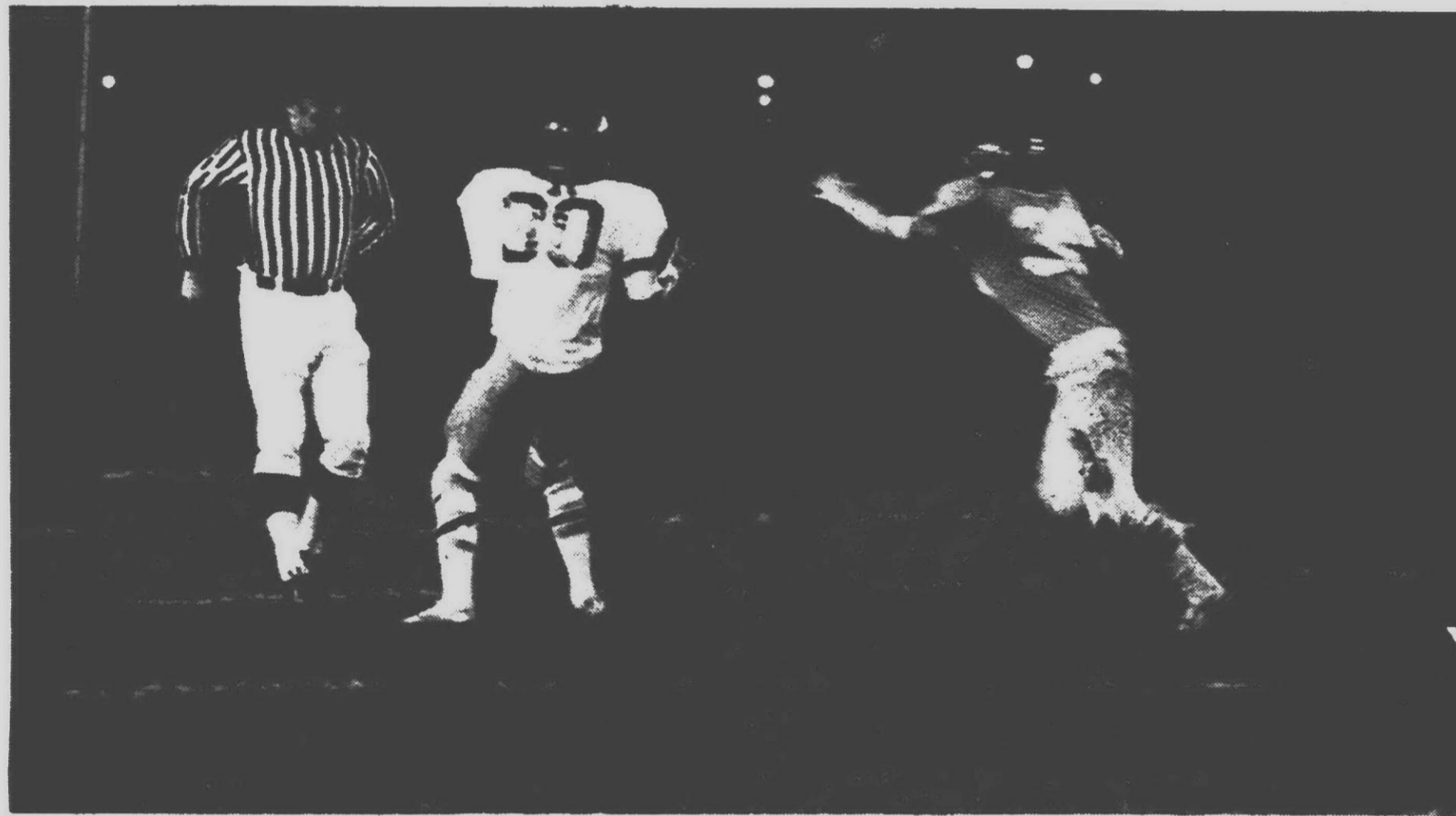
which hasn't lost a dual meet in two years, has won 19 consecutive dual victories and placed four runners in the first seven finishers in the Tri-River League race.

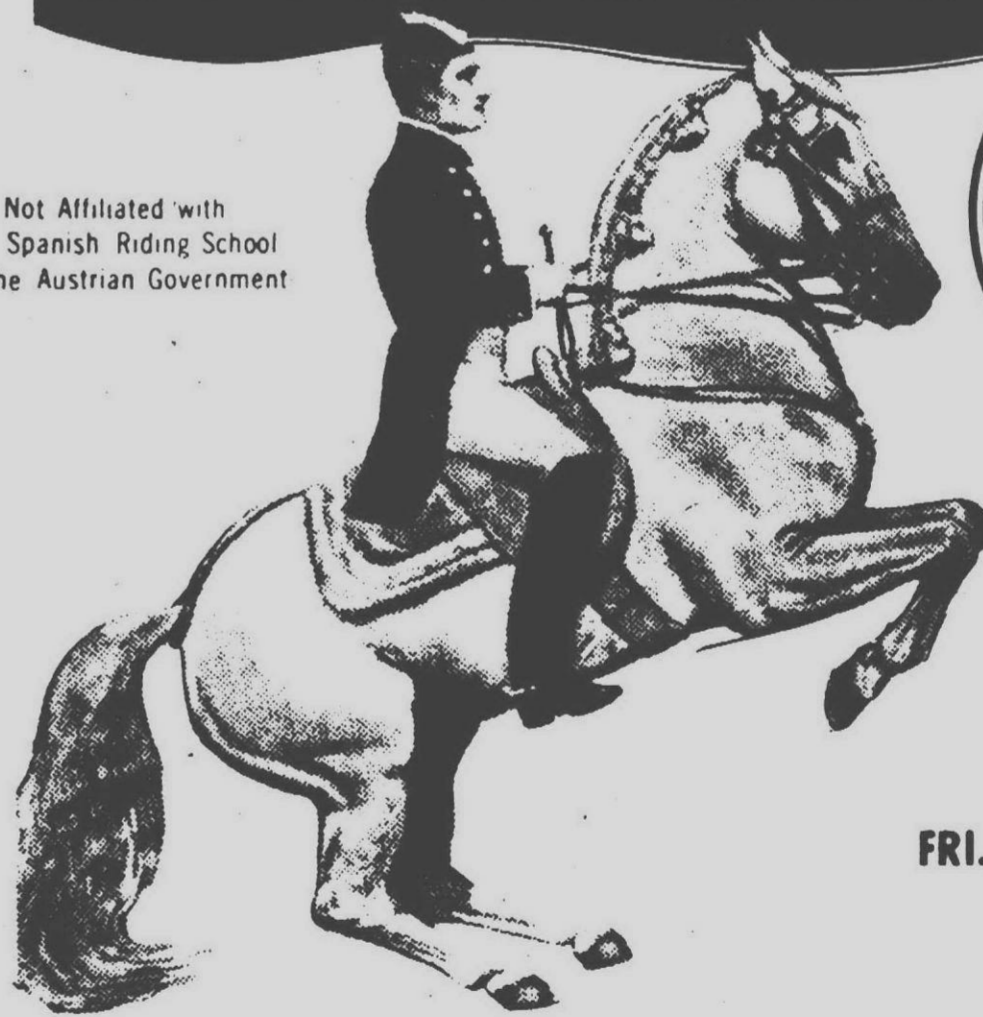

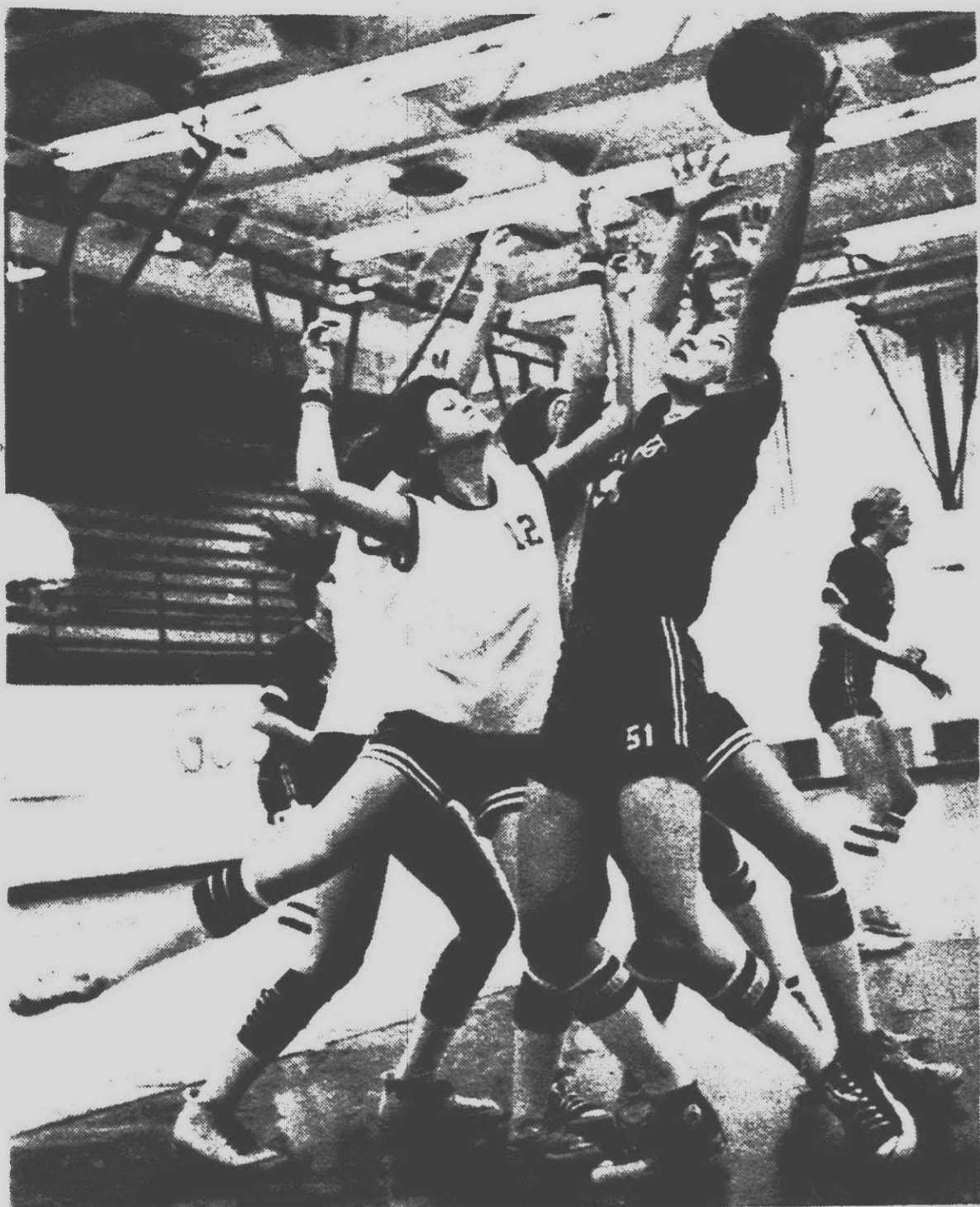

Plymouth Salem's girls basketball squad blitzed Redford Union with a 24-4 fourth quarter scoring explosion to bury the visiting Pantherettes, 66-52, and claim the Suburban Eight championship.

Coach Ken Dersey's RU girls led all the way until Salem's relentless man-to-man defense wore down the talented visitors and made the comeback possible.

The Pantherettes led at the quarter breaks by scores of 14-12, 31-26 and 48-42 before a burst of 17 consecutive points by the Rocks put the game on ice.

"I'm thrilled to death that a team with a man-to-man defense won this ball game," said a delighted Debbie Hatcher, now in her third year as Salem coach. "For some reason we play better when we're behind and sometimes have a hard time getting rolling. But when we get hot, we usually finish with a flourish."

Redford Union, sporting a scintillating 11-2 mark, invaded Salem's gym Thursday night, fully intent on avenging an earlier, 53-49, setback at the hands of Salem on its home court.

## Deluca's kick defeats Wayne

Westland John Glenn posted the winningest season in the school's 10-year history when it rode Todd Deluca's fourth quarter 30-yard field goal to a 3-0 over archrival Wayne Memorial Friday night for the Rockets' eighth win in nine games.

The winning three-pointer came with just 2:18 left in the fiercely contested intra-city rivalry that was played before the largest crowd since the grid series started.

"It was the greatest high school game I've ever been a part of," said coach Lloyd Carr, now in his third year as head of the Rockets, who were 2-6 in 1973 and 5-3 last year.

Glenn's only loss this year was a 20-13 decision to Livonia Franklin.

Glenn ran up 230 total yards to just 70 total net yards for the host team. The Rockets' front wall held Zebra runners to just 10 yards net rushing the entire game.

However, Wayne had two chances to score after a Glenn third quarter fumble and also after a long pass completion and 15-yard subsequent penalty late in the game.

After a scoreless first half, Glenn fumbled the second half kickoff on its 20 yard line and Wayne Memorial had

good field position the entire 24 minutes. However, the Zebras' TD thrust was blunted by Terry Bixler's pass interception in the endzone.

The team's battled back and forth and Wayne's Pat Sheridan punted one kick of 60 yards and another of more than 50 to keep Glenn bottled up.

The Rockets got the ball with 6:30 left in the game on their own 30, and moved 70 yards for the deciding field goal. Key play in the drive was on a third-and-11 situation when sophomore back Jerry Cook sprinted 19 yards on a counter play.

When the drive stalled on the Wayne 21 yard line, Deluca booted the field goal from the right hash mark and the ball barely sailed over the crossbar for the winning points.

Wayne made one last-gasp effort when it completed a 50-yard pass play with two minutes left on a fourth-and-20 play that carried to the Glenn 13 yard line with the help of a 15-yard penalty.

However, a sack of the quarterback by middle guard Mark Grabowski and a blocked field goal attempt by tackle Jeff Cuddeback sealed Wayne's defeat.

## St. Agatha romps

Senior halfback Gerard Trujillo scored on runs of 20 and 28 yards the first two times St. Agatha had possession of the ball and the Aggies went on to take a 38-0 season concluding football victory over Hamtramck Immaculate Conception Friday.

The victory gave St. Agatha a 6-3 final mark, up from 5-3 last year.

Trujillo's runs capped drives of 66 and 58 yards and got the Aggies off to a roaring start. Immaculate Conception dug in and held the Aggies scoreless for the rest of the half, but the roof caved in after that.

Dennis Wright started the second-half fireworks when he went three yards on a quarterback sneak in the third quarter.

Wright then hit Kevin Murphy for a two-point conversion to make it 22-0.

Early in the fourth quarter, Jim Petriches went five yards on a sweep to remove all doubt and give St. Agatha a 28-point margin.

Wright improved that by two more when he went over for the conversion.

# Salem rallies, but stolen pass seals doom

The Farmington Harrison Hawks came up with timely scoring, and supported by an obstinate defense, downed the Plymouth Salem Rocks 17-7, in the annual season finale between the clubs at Plymouth's Centennial Park Stadium Friday night.

Harrison, runner-up in the Western Six conference, ran 14 rushing plays en route to its first score. The Hawks took possession of the opening kickoff from their own 40-yard line and used

six minutes moving the 60 yards for the game's initial score.

Junior fullback John Payne climaxed the drive on a one-yard dive. Paul Rogind's conversion gave Harrison a 7-0 lead. Harrison held the Rocks on their series and drove to Salem's 34 before fumbling the ball away.

Harrison was unable to get the wheels of their offensive machine in gear.

Quarterback Jeff Thorne threw four passes in the first half for the Hawks,

three of his aeriels being intercepted by the alert Salem secondary.

Senior cornerback Joe Scott, safety Dick Bradburn, and Kevin Grahn pilfered Thorne's passes which, forced the offense to keep on the ground.

Although Harrison held the upper hand in total yardage in the first half, 119 to 23, and in first downs nine to one, the halftime score saw the Hawks lead by a touchdown, 7-0.

The third quarter was indicative of the solid defensive play that both teams displayed.

Salem was unable to make a first down, while Harrison could gain only one against a Salem defense which tightened up considerably after the Hawks' scoring drive.

Harrison padded their margin midway through the final stanza. The running tandem of Paul Rogind and Mike Bowden gained big chunks of yardage to keep this drive alive. Greg White's 25-yard catch set up a field goal attempt for Rogind at the Salem 27 yard line.

Rogind split the uprights from 42 yards out to put Harrison up 10-0 with 7:23 left in the game. What momentum Harrison might've accumulated after Rogind's kick diminished on Salem's next series.

On their first play from scrimmage after the kickoff the Rocks quickly closed the deficit to three points. Quarterback Ben Wilcox, who completed four of nine passes for 101 yards, found fullback Charlie Johnson with a pass on a slant pattern over the middle.

Johnson muscled his way out of the

grasp of three Harrison defenders to complete a 76-yard scoring play to make matters more exciting. Rick Doherty's conversion made it 10-7 with 6:55 remaining in the game.

On Salem's next series Harrison

iced the victory when Tim Harsha returned an intercepted pass 65 yards for a touchdown. That score made the final Farmington Harrison 17, Plymouth Salem 7.

Plymouth Salem mustered 197 total

yards, 96 on the ground while passing for 101 yards. Harrison counted 163 net yards with 114 being accomplished between the running of Rogind, Bowden and Payne.

Canton finished last year with a 3-6 mark, but this year's schedule saw the Chiefs play some solid football teams. Muneio philosophized, "I think you become a better ball club if you're scheduled with the tougher teams."

Canton will look forward to next season with definite hopes on improving its record. The Chiefs will be getting some players from the junior varsity squad. Next fall will be the first year the varsity will get players from the junior squad.

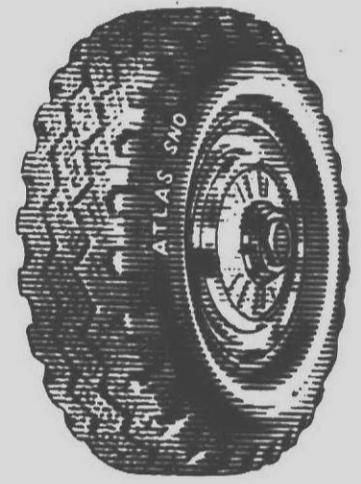

# Plymouth could use a beautification committee

Many municipalities have a horde of boards and commissions with overlapping or vague responsibilities. This isn't the case in the City of Plymouth. Indeed it could use one more agency.

An important undertaking by business, residences and government is beautification of the community. Merchants in the central business district are dressing up entrances and planting trees along Ann Arbor Trail. Merchants along Ann Arbor Road are in the midst of a massive beautification effort.

A number of residents who have moved into older houses in the city have undertaken individual beautification projects to update their residences and add beauty to their block.

ALL OF THIS is happening with the city's knowledge and involvement, but there isn't a cohesive force providing assistance where needed or defining what is desirable for those who voluntarily want to adhere to a theme.

What is needed is a beautification committee to serve as a corps of experts to offer help to residents and merchants involved in face-lifting projects.

Members of the beautification committee could be landscape architects, horticulturists, nursery-

men, masons, and representatives of local garden clubs.

THE BEAUTIFICATION committee can become aligned with the Southeast Michigan Beautification Commission which is a transmittal agency on what other communities are doing in the area of beautification.

Besides offering professional advice, the committee could draft ordinances for the city commission's consideration and could conduct residential, business and industrial beautification contests to promote those who have taken action.

The committee should work closely with the planning commission as an equal partner in city government. It should, however, be appointed by and answerable directly to the city commission instead of being a subcommittee of the planning commission.

Interviews conducted by this newspaper during the recent city commission campaign indicate a need for a beautification committee as another arm of government. The city commission should consider this and contact nearby cities which have beautification committees in operation.

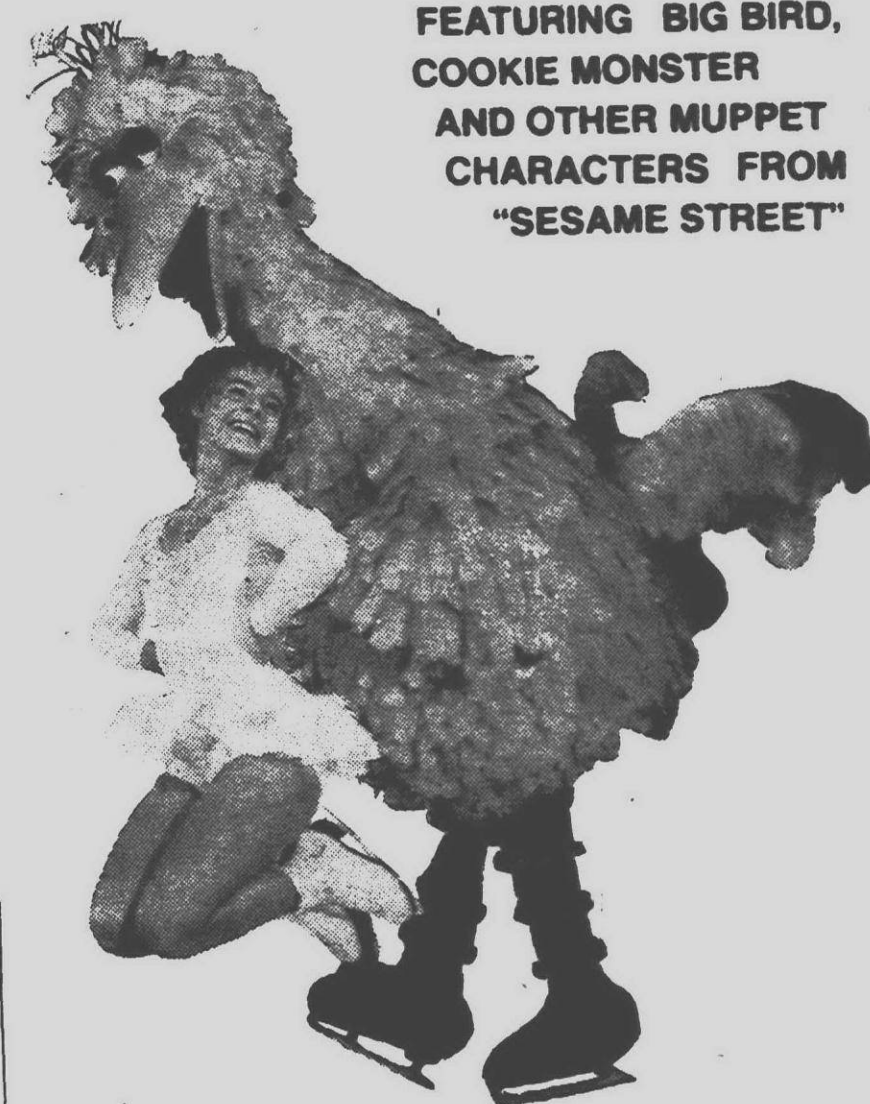

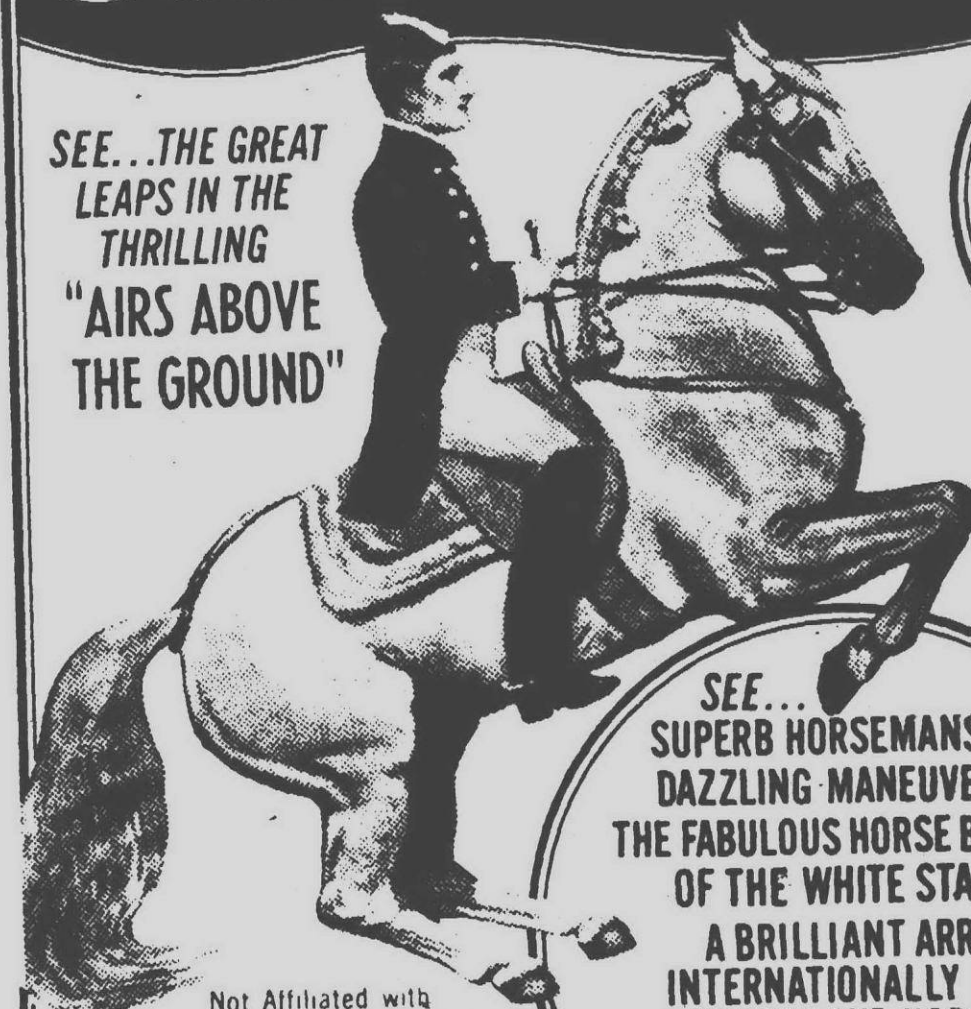

# SEMCOG leaders sway vote against Detroit

Led by Schoolcraft College's Arch Vallier and Southfield Councilman John Marcosky, the general assembly of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments has in effect voted disapproval of a tripartite agreement to

give the City of Detroit a greater voice in the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority. The tripartite agreement was made by Gov. William Milliken, Detroit Mayor Coleman Young and SEMTA. It calls for Young to appoint five Detroiters, SEMCOG to appoint five suburbanites, and Milliken to appoint three others subject to the approval of six of the other 10 SEMTA board members.

At present, SEMCOG's general assembly appoints six SEMTA board members, and the governor three. The tripartite agreement would have been acceptable to SEMCOG's executive committee under a resolution passed in October.

**BUT THE GENERAL** assembly, the final policymaking body, nixed the idea last week. With only one dissent (from Washtenaw County), the general assembly approved Marcosky's resolution which said in part: "Since SEMCOG's general assembly, composed of local elected officials, has adopted a policy position in support of appointments by the general assembly to the boards of single-purpose authorities, we strongly urge that the SEMTA board continue to include SEMCOG's general assembly as the majority appointing authority and that one unit of government shall not have a majority vote on the SEMTA board."

Vallier, a Schoolcraft College

trustee and SEMCOG delegate, started the long debate with his successful bid to table the executive committee resolution, which had asked only that SEMCOG be "an" appointing authority.

He was quickly joined by Livonia Councilman Jerry Raymond, who said the executive committee's resolution "addresses itself to nothing. It says, 'When decisions are made, we hope you'll remember we exist.'"

"If there is to be regionalism," Raymond went on, "it must be all-over regionalism. This (SEMCOG general assembly) is where the authority belongs."

Plymouth Mayor Beverly McAninch added her objections to the tripartite agreement: "Let's not let SEMCOG be put into a position of representing only the suburbs."

Delbert Hoffman, a Monroe County delegate (and 2nd District candidate for congress), said, "The SEMTA board should stay the same."

**AFTER THE** executive committee resolution was denounced and tabled, Marcosky, reelected to the Southfield City Council two days earlier, rose at the meeting was about to end, and reopened the discussion.

Larry Pernick, Oakland County commissioner from Southfield, urged the SEMCOG assembly to act promptly because it meets only every three months and the problem is current.

"If the legislature is to act (on implementing the tripartite agreement), it must act before the end of the year," said Pernick. "We have a unique organization here (in SEMCOG). We have 105 different governments talking about a common problem."

Bloomfield Hills School District Supt. C. Henry Haberkorn offered a simple motion to express disapproval of the tripartite agreement and reorganization of the SEMTA board, but it was voted down as "negative," in the words of Fred Houghten, Oakland County commissioner from Rochester. Marcosky then introduced his resolution, the preamble of which argued the case for SEMCOG's involvement in SEMTA:

"SEMCOG recognizes the strong link that must continue to exist between the citizens of the region, the regional planning agency (SEMCOG) and the regional public transportation agency (SEMTA) if the people of southeast Michigan are to have an effective public transit system . . ."

"SEMCOG is the only vehicle in the region which has representation from all levels of government . . . SEMCOG has served as an appointing authority since the passage of Act 204 (creating SEMTA) in 1967, and has done so in a fair and open manner which has increased governmental acceptability . . ."

## Detroit named to SEMTA seat

Walter E. Douglas, the personal choice of Detroit Mayor Coleman Young, was unanimously appointed to the board of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority last week.

The appointment was made by the general assembly of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. In an informal version of the "one person, one vote" principle, SEMCOG had allocated this SEMTA seat to a Detroit. as it does with other localities.

The selection is thought by some to represent a victory for Young, who with Gov. William Milliken has been seeking to change a state law to give the Detroit mayor five appointments to a restructured 13-member SEMTA board.

At present, SEMCOG is the appointing authority for six SEMTA posts, with the governor naming three. SEMCOG opposes the kind of change Milliken and Young want to make (see related story in this edition).

The Observer & Eccentric learned

that a half-dozen names were submitted by various sources to the SEMCOG executive director, Michael Glusac, and all were turned over to Young, who made the final nomination.

When SEMCOG's general assembly delegates opened their packets of materials last week, Walter Douglas' was the only name before them.

Douglas, 43, succeeds Mattie Meyers, who vacated the post automatically on pleading guilty in federal court to financial mismanagement on another project.

Douglas is a vice president of New Detroit, Inc., where he is responsible for programs in employment, community development, minority economic development and community relations.

A native of North Carolina, he has been an instructor and public relations officer for a Florida college, a teacher at Tuskegee Institute in Alabama and assistant director of the Internal Revenue Service data center in Michigan. He is an accountant.

## Great Lakes bottomland bill passes House

A hotly-debated bill to protect historical artifacts on Great Lakes bottomland has passed the State House of Representatives, 71-29, with strong local support. It goes next to the Senate.

The bill would give the state first claim on artifacts salvaged by divers if the state deems them of historic importance. The state would set the price paid to the finder.

"I sorta felt this was taking away another privilege we have," said Rep. Roy Smith (R-Ypsilanti), whose district includes most of Plymouth. "What incentive is there to go scuba diving? It's more regulating, more control."

Smith was the only area representative to oppose the bill. Supporting it were Reps. John Bennett (D-Red-

ford), Thomas Brown (D-Westland), Robert Geake (R-Northville) and John Markes (D-Westland). Absent was Rep. William Keith (D-Garden City).

Geake, who supported it, said the State Department of Natural Resources has designated 10 spots in the Great Lakes and Lake St. Clair as historic bottomlands, but this bill would apply to all bottomlands in those lakes.

## Grants for gifted approved by state

Gifted students within the Livonia School District will benefit by the continuation of state funding for 12 projects for gifted and talented students throughout the state.

A total of \$200,000 has been approved by the State Board of Education for projects in Livonia and 41 other districts.

## U-M engineers offer tune-up clinic

The University of Michigan Student Chapter of the Society of Automotive Engineers is sponsoring its 12th auto emission tune-up clinic.

Consisting of a free public classroom session for car owners on Nov. 13 and a tune-up workshop for 35 selected cars on Nov. 15, the clinic will be presented in cooperation with AC-Delco Division of General Motors Corp. and A&L Auto Parts of Ann Arbor.

The tune-up classroom session will begin at 7:30 p.m. in Auditorium B, Angell Hall, on U-M's central campus. The workshop will be conducted at the Automotive Engineering Laboratory on U-M's North Campus.

"In view of our current economic problems, the clinic becomes especially timely for two reasons: participants can save money by learning to tune their cars themselves, and a properly tuned car cuts consumption of costly fuel," says tune-up clinic director David Parta, senior in mechanical engineering at U-M. He adds that last spring's clinic resulted in significant reductions in hydrocarbon and

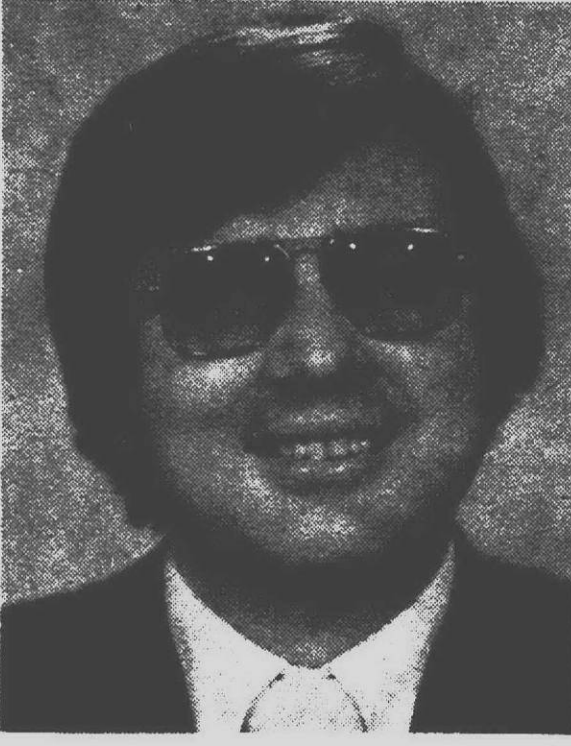
carbon monoxide emissions of the cars qualifying for tune-ups.

Topics for the Nov. 13 classroom session include engine components involved in a tune-up and how to adjust or replace them. The session will be conducted by Clyde Cook, a tune-up specialist from AC-Delco Division of GM.

The 35 persons attending the classroom session will be eligible to participate in the 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. workshop on Nov. 15. However, cars selected may not be equipped with dual exhausts. Only one car per family will be permitted, and a fee of \$5 will be charged for participation in the workshop, \$6 if the car has air-conditioning.

Specialists from AC and U-M mechanical engineering students will be on hand to assist novice mechanics. Equipment available for use at the North Campus Auto Lab includes five diagnostic units. Provided through the courtesy of A&L Auto Parts of Ann Arbor and AC, these machines can pinpoint parts needing attention. A&L is also supplying forms available at the classroom session which qualify holders for a ten per cent discount on tune-up parts.

The U-M students sponsoring the clinic will make before-and-after emission checks on each car tuned during the workshop.

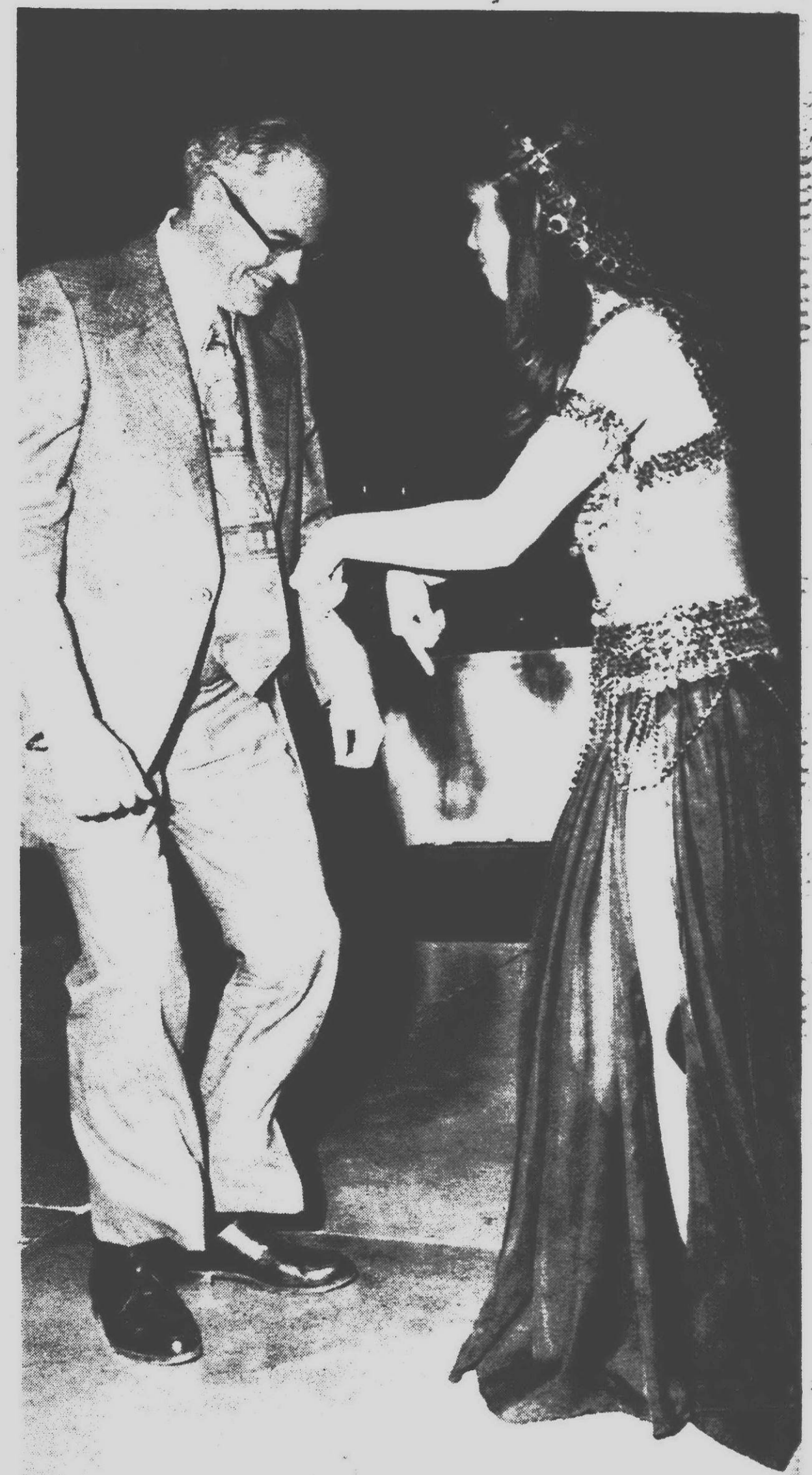

## Executive Chef Gaudet supervisors inn cuisine

John Gaudet, a squat little French lad who was born 47 years ago in the heart of the lobster country near Bangor, Me., traveled an unusual route to become executive chef at the new Plymouth Hilton Inn on Northville Road.

He laughs about it now when he recalls he started working as an electrician and planned on advancing that career when he entered the U.S. Army.

"Instead, they put me on kitchen duty," he chuckles. "That's where I learned to cook. And I've been at it ever since."

During his years in the service, Gaudet served with the U.S. troops in Salzburg, Austria, and later in Stuttgart, Germany, where he was a special chef for the generals.

"I also had some experience as a mess sergeant, too," he adds.

Catching the attention of the generals he was selected to attend a five-week seminar in Paris. It was there he made up his mind to make a career as a chef.

Since his return from the service, Gaudet, who now lives in Garden City, has served in many top eating establishments in the east and midwest.

He had the thrill of starting in his hometown at the Oronka Club and remained there for five years. He was chef at the Westwood Inn, back in the days when the Westwood Gardens were popular. He also is remembered for his three years of service at Bonnie Brook Golf Club and lately at Detroit's Metropolitan Airport.

Like any lad born in the lobster country, Gaudet confides he likes to prepare lobster more than any other dish. All the while he speaks of the delicious seafood his eyes sparkle. He, like many of the customers, only wishes that the cost of the delicacy

was more in keeping with the middle man's purse.

Over the years he has been wearing the high white hat, Gaudet has seen many changes in the public's eating habits.

"People today are more conscious of their weight," he says, "and there has been a falling off of fatty foods. They want fancy dishes but without many calories."

As the executive chef at the new Hilton, Gaudet is designing the major kitchen and hopes to have at least six cooks working under him when the large, new dining room is opened later this month.

While he is looking forward to his new position, he only wishes there would be more lovers of seafood besides those who like lobster.

"There are a lot of good seafood items," he says, "but the general public in this part of the country doesn't know about them. Maybe I can win them over with new dishes."

# What feelings are 'abnormal' for a widow?

Am I abnormal?  
This question from a widow at the conference on widowhood at Schoolcraft College was the kind that keynote speaker, Dr. Phyllis Silverman had come all the way from the Harvard Medical School in Boston to answer.  
The questioner first noted that her husband had died three months before and that she seemed to feel nothing.

She spent her time "running 24 hours a day - the house seems so empty."  
"Is that abnormal?"  
Dr. Silverman responded: "Abnormal? What has that got to do with feeling lousy?"  
"How else could you do it? People are numbed by the experience. They have to lift out gradually, and activities like these allow you to keep going. If you let all your feelings out at once, you could literally fall to pieces. This numbness helps you take it in."

"It would be unrealistic at three months to expect you to be any better. Many think that in six weeks a widow is back to normal. Ha. Ha. It takes two years maybe."  
This is not the time to sedate people, she declared. "I argue with doctors about this. The widow has to cope with her children, decide if they should attend the funeral, get them off to school and confront other realities."

ABOUT 225 ATTENDED the day-long conference planned by the community services department and Newman Center at the college. It was designed to reassure widows about the emotional aspects of bereavement and to point them toward forming self-help groups of widows in their communities.

Dr. Silverman, originator of the widow-to-widow program, noted in her speech that "if a widow wants to begin to shift gears, another widow is the most helpful person to talk to."

"Friends and relatives of a widow will rally round for about a month. But then when you are about to talk, who can you talk to? At this time you have to find psychiatric help or find another widowed person, or flounder."

Reaching out to other widows is being done all over the country, she observed.

The western suburbs may be no exception. According to Peggy Price, one of the conference planners, "there was tremendous response, from women at the seminar who expressed interest in forming groups in their own communities."

Her statistics indicated that the conferees came from 36 Michigan cities or towns and two Ohio cities. More than half were widows, the rest being ministers, social workers or other professionals interested in the problems of widowhood.

"The next thing to do is to provide training ideas for people ready to begin programs using widow volunteers," said Mrs. Price.

QUESTIONS FROM members of the audience evolved around many subjects including dating. "If you don't want sex, don't do it," she advised. "You have to feel comfortable and live by your own standards."

She added: "I wouldn't get that kind of question in Boston."

Another question concerning selling property.

"Don't move precipitously to sell your house."

How about children who want their widowed mother to stay home and babysit for them.

"Tell them to live their own lives and you'll live yours," said Dr. Silverman to loud murmurs of approval from the audience.

She also suggested that widowed people share their feelings with their children, telling about a child who accused his father of not caring that Mommy died because he didn't cry. He cried alone.

"Kids grieve," she said. "But their bereavement is not always expressed in tears. They are confused. The younger they are the harder it is for them to understand the reality of the situation."

"Young children need an enormous amount of comforting. Sometimes they are afraid to leave the house for fear the other parent may die."

"The worst thing is to have no discussion about it."

OURS IS a death-avoiding society in the speaker's opinion. We want people to act as if it didn't happen. We want them to get over their grief quickly and get back to normal.

"But bereavement is a normal process," she claimed. "If you don't grieve you're not alive. You've never been involved."

"I don't know any widows who don't have nightmares in which their husband is usually alive, and then they wake up and he's gone."

She finds it very exciting to work with widowed people.

"You are helping to build something new out of adversity and pain. You help them find new resources and strengths in themselves to build on for tomorrow. They are on the threshold of something new."

Cooking oil (enough to cover bottom of skillet)

- 1 teaspoon red pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon turmeric
- 3/4 teaspoon curry powder
- 1/4 teaspoon cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon coriander, powdered
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon garam Masala
- 3 onions, chopped
- 1 cup long grain rice, cooked
- 1/2 pound shrimp, cooked, cleaned (medium size)

Stir all spices in slightly heated oil, add onions; allow them to become soft (5 minutes). Stir in rice and shrimp, while still hot. The dish is ready to serve immediately. Spices may be slightly increased or decreased according to your liking for spicy dishes. Serves 4-5.

**Tune-ups important**

# A well-maintained car won't need winterizing

Motorists who have followed the regularly scheduled program of car care prescribed in the owner's manual can forget about winterizing, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

"While fall tune-ups are fine for your car's ignition and fuel systems," said Auto Club Emergency Road Service Manager Robert M. Smith, "they do nothing for the car's cooling system, battery, exhaust system or many other key components."

"Most 'can't start' calls for assistance are the result of vehicle neglect rather than vehicle failure," Smith said. "Poorly tuned engines and weak batteries are responsible for 80 percent all wintertime emergency road service calls."

Having maintenance work done as recommended by the vehicle manufacturer rather than seasonal tune-ups is economical because it eliminates costly repairs which occur through neglect.

For vehicle owners who have not followed the detailed maintenance instructions in their car owner's manual, Smith offers this 10-point check list for keeping a car in peak operating condition, once it is properly tuned:

1. Check plugs and points regularly. Dirty or worn plugs waste gas and put an added strain on the battery because they require more electricity than clean plugs. If points are worn, they cannot deliver peak power to plugs.
2. Have car's automatic choke cleaned and adjusted. If automatic choke doesn't cut down when engine is warmed up, gasoline is wasted.
3. Inspect the colling system. Hoses, radi-

ator, pressure cap and thermostat as well as the antifreeze level should be checked regularly.

4. Make sure car battery is fully charged, with terminals clean and secure and watj covering battery plates. Battery should be free from cracks or corrosion. Periodic inspections will assure that battery is properly charged.

5. Check voltage regulator. An undercharged battery will fail and an overcharged battery will buckle its cover and bulge the sides, causing leaks.

6. Is the exhaust system noisy? A rusty or leaky muffler or exhaust manifold is a carbon monoxide hazard.

7. Check windshield wipers and washers for proper operation. Worn or poorly functioning wiper blades cut visibility and should be replaced. Water in the windshield washer reservoir should have an added solvent all year long. It not only prevents freezing, but helps wipers remove slush or accumulation for better visibility.

8. Make sure defrosters and heater are working properly. Defrosters help keep windshield clear and the heater will take the chill off winter morning.

9. Check fan belt and other belts for proper adjustment and replace them if worn. A slipping belt affects the alternator and operation a car air conditioner.

10. Have a periodic general safety check made every 10,000 miles, including inspection of brakes, headlights, hoses, turn signals, back-up lights and tires. Check brake and transmission fluid levels and fluid level in the rear axle.
