

Morale booster Yearn to live, speaker urges

He's a man who's touched hundreds with his personal crusade to convince teenagers that they need not turn to suicide as an answer to their problems.

Earlier this month, Canton resident Jim Tuman spoke before a substantially smaller audience. It was plain to see, though, that his

had leukemia and that he had sold everything he owned, including his business, and was traveling the country before he died.

"I had this sudden sense of urgency to see and talk to him, he affected me that much. 'Everyone of you in the room

has the power to influence thousands.

TUMAN IS NOT new to the

feelings issues."

He advocated instituting support programs from "the time we begin to see the pain" in teenagers.

"Somehow we've missed the boat nobody can really identify where they fit in."

AT ONE POINT, in an effort to emphasize the misplaced importance of money in today's society, he reached out into the audience and tore up a dollar bill offered by a young girl. "I know people who have compromised themselves for this," Tuman said, pointing to the ripped bill on the floor. "If this is the only reason you get up everyday then there will never be enough of it. "How do you know you don't have only six months to live? There are no guarantees. So if you're waiting for time to put priorities on the people in your life, then there may not be enough time." Looking to the adults in the audience, Tuman said that the problems don't stop in school. "The older we get, it's just a different set of toys. Tuman, whose talks have been captured on local television stations, showed video tapes of recent school meetings. Audience members witnessed a roller coaster of emotions as hundreds of teens at a local high school clung to each other as Tuman admonished parents and teachers for failing to reach students.

Cal Kemppainen a lot about painting wildlife

Kemppainen laughs when he recalls the owl, the first of his wildlife paintings that now win praise in state competitions. He had the detail right - the gray feathers tinged in black, the dark eyes, the body shape.

There's just one problem with the work, showing the bird in its habitat: "I painted a perfect stuffed owl," said Kemppainen of the lifeless-looking bird. "You have to get the gesture of the animal; the way it would sit naturally."

Since then, the Canton sign painter and part-time artist has gone on to place in the final 10 entries in the 1986 Michigan State Duck Stamp Competition.

It's a significant achievement, considering he placed above several artists who paint wildlife full time. Kemppainen was also invited to join Michigan's top wildlife artists in displaying his work at the Michigan Great Lakes Wildlife Festival during Memorial Day weekend in Claire.

ORIGINALLY A landscape painter, Kemppainen, 36, got into wildlife painting about five years ago.

The Westland native's interest in birds led him to collected prints of Robert Bateman, a renowned Canadian wildlife artist.

"I thought, 'What a fantastic artist,' and on top of that, he did wildlife.

In the upstairs studio of his Canton home, Kemppainen keeps several books depicting in detail the anato-

my of various birds.

'Once you decide you're going to do one, you have to have it accurate," he said. "In these competitions, especially the duck-stamp competition, they count feathers. They'll know if the bill is not angled properly. You need to really research your subject extensively."

While painting a Kool cigarette billboard ad in Belleville, Kemppainen got the idea to do a painting of a red-tail hawk, with the viewer looking over the shoulder of the bird perched high in a tree.

"I thought it would be kind of neat to do a portrait from the bird's perspective," he said.

words work wonders even in smaller circles.

Tuman, an advocate of developing self-esteem in teens as a method of reducing the increasing suicide rate among high school students, spoke before a crowd of 23 parents and teens June 5 in the Canton Public Library.

THE EFFECT was typical for Tuman's forums.

"Who's the most important person you know?" Tuman asked the crowd.

The crowd hedged. Few raised their hands. Even fewer wanted to say what they knew Tuman was expecting.

"Why is that so difficult to say?" he asked, responding to one audience member's answer that she was most important. "We are so busy working off of other people's standards that we can't see our own value."

As a promoter of three national programs aimed at women, children and Vietnam veterans, and as a nationwide speaker on teens, Tuman says he has had a lot of time to examine his own values.

He told the audience of a personal experience which led to his renewed conviction that adults and teens must set priorities in their lives and stick with them.

"I met this man in a restaurant when he sat down beside me. At first I acted disinterested but he kept talking to me. He told me he realm of influencing people.

In what has become a typical reaction to his speeches, teens routinely gather around each other, confessing their problems, embracing or simply crying.

Emotions were equally high in the smaller crowd as parents and teenagers wiped their eyes. Two teenagers, veterans of Tuman's earlier talks, testified to his effective approach to teen problems.

Mark Hackett and Tracy Reardon, both 15 and students at Lowell Middle School in Westland, are victims of increasing peer pressure and loss of self-esteem.

Both have attempted suicide. Both admit now that it was Tuman who helped them gain back the confidence they had lost to continue living.

Tuman's talks have "a big effect on everybody," said Hackett. "Students really get into it.'

"It lasts long after he leaves," Reardon agreed, adding that she has much closer friends now than before.

"He just senses things," Hackett said, describing Tuman as succinctly as he could.


"Kids today are overwhelmed by everything," said Tuman. "We have to realize that put-downs hurt. It means that we've stopped looking at each other's needs.

Tuman said that school curriculums are " . . . so curriculum centered that teachers don't look at

How does Tuman know he's reaching kids? He pointed to the videotape and to the look on the faces of his audience.

In what perhaps could be considered the best testimonial to his success in reaching out were Hackett's final remarks.

"I just don't feel like I have to take my own life to feel better now."



Charge filed after molestation near school

A Dearborn man has been charged with molesting an 11-yearold Canton girl near Hulsing Elementary School after allegedly confessing to two incidents involving school children in Livonia.

Livonia Police said they suspected Paul Brian Hurin, 21, was involved in the Livonia cases and linked him as a possible suspect in Canton. Hurin voluntarily turned himself into Livonia Police and admitted to the Canton and two Livo-

nia cases, said Canton Police Detective Robert Sidor.

Hurin said he had a problem and wanted professional help, Sidor wrote in a police report.

The Canton girl told police she was walking with two friends to school on a wooded footpath to Hulsing Elementary School. A man ran out, held out his arms and blocked the pathway. She said he grabbed her from behind and fondled her.

Police are still investigating the Livonia cases that took place in May and June near Washington Elementary School and Hoover Elementary School, according to Livonia Police Sgt. Ann Dempsey.

A PARENT whose child attends Washington said a composite of the Canton attacker that ran in the Observer fit the description a Livonia

Police said Hurin admitted to the two Livonia incidents under questioning from Livonia Officer James Pardo. He also told officers he developed "this problem about six months ago," according to a Canton Police report.

"Livonia police played a really big part in this, as well as the use of the identification kit," Sidor said. "When you've got a face in-stead of just a description it's a lot better. We also got a lot of tips and help from people in the public."

Hurin was arraigned last week in 35th District Court before Judge John MacDonald on one count of second-degree criminal sexual conduct in connection with the Canton case. Second-degree CSC is a felony and carries a maximum 15 years in prison.

A plea of not guilty was entered.

Hurin's father posted 10 percent of a \$15,000 bond. He is scheduled to appear Monday, June 23, in 35th District Court for a preliminary examination to determine if there is enough evidence to hold a trial.

As a result of the Canton incident parents raised concerns about the wooded pathway near Hulsing.

"The Canton DPW will still clear the path back not only at Hulsing but they will check all school areas and take similar measures to remove brush," said Canton Police Chief John Santomauro.







Report given on Allen virus

Investigators trying to determine the cause of the viral outbreak at Allen Elementary School April 21 that affected more than 150 students and staff say that while the virus has been identified, "we will probably never know" the exact source of the contamination.

Dr. Donald Lawrenchuk, medical director of the Wayne County Department of Health, reported that following tests and attack-rate studies, investigators believe "that water or food items prepared using water may have contributed to the outbreak."

However, Lawrenchuk said this can't be confirmed because when his department first gathered samples April 23 at the school, both water and food were found free of contamination.

Investigators report they are satisfied that the virus was a Norwalktype virus, which typically causes stomach ailments and diarrhea symptoms reported by those becoming ill at Allen School following contamination.



UDAG MONEY - By a vote of 93 for and 289 against, the House rejected an amendment to kill the Urban Development Action Grant (UDAG) program by denying it fiscal 1987 funding.

This rebuffed President Reagan, who wants to eliminate the politically popular program. UDAG grants, the majority of which have benefitted depressed areas of northern cities, provide federal seed money for private projects such as hotels and shopping centers.

Fiscal 1987's UDAG funding level is estimated at \$280 million, down from this year's \$316 million.

The vote came during debate on a multi-year authorization measure (HR 1) that extends some 50 major housing and community development programs. The bill, carrying a








GOP seeks to gain **McCollough seat**

By Tim Richard staff writer

Republicans intend to add two more state Senate seats to their 20-18 majority Nov. 4.

Senate Majority Leader John Engler, R-Mount Pleasant, said GOP targets are the seat being vacated by Democrat Patrick McCollough of Dearborn and Sen. Jerome Hart, D-Saginaw.

State Rep. William Runco, R-Dearborn, who is seeking McCollough's slot, served notice last week he'll make senior citizen property tax relief a key issue. Tackling the House leadership, Runco tried unsuccessfully to force a Republican bill out of committee for a floor vote.

ENGLER, in a news conference, called Runco, 32, "outstanding," noting that McCollough, 44, "chose to retire rather than face Runco. He's well organized and off to a good start," Engler said.

Other possible targets, the GOP leader said, are Democratic Sens. Jack Faxon of Farmington Hills, Lana Pollack of Ann Arbor and Mitch Irwin of Sault Ste. Marie.

(Democratic State Chairman Rick Wiener earlier laughed at the suggestion Faxon could be beaten. Wiener said his party would target Republican Sens. Rudy Nichols of Waterford and Kirby Holmes of Uti-

(Nichols and Holmes won special 1984 elections after Democratic senators were recalled over the 1983 income tax increase.)

MINUTES AFTER Engler's news conference, Runco took the House floor to ask that the Taxation Committee be forced to report out a Senate-passed bill cutting senior citizens' homestead property taxes.

His motion failed in a 29-66 vote. Supporting Runco were all area **Republicans except Judith Miller of** Birmingham, who voted no, and Lyn Bankes of Livonia, who didn't vote.

All Democrats voted against him. "The bill had strong bipartisan support in the Senate," said Runco. "Seniors are especially hurt by the property tax. While they live on fixed incomes, their property taxes keep rising with their valuations."

The bill would apply to persons age 65 or older with homesteads assessed for \$65,000 or less. The state would pay the school operating portions of their property taxes, a cost Runco put at \$13 million a year. "It can be paid out of the state sur-

plus," he added.

HOUSE SPEAKER Gary Owen, D-Ypsilanti, in a rare floor speech, attacked Runco as a politician "who votes yes on spending, no on raising revenue, and hopes more responsible members will figure out how to balance the budget.'

"Runco will add his yes votes to the K-12 school aid and community college appropriations, and he'll go back to Dearborn and tell what a great job he's doing," Owen said.

Runco won his House seat in a 1982 upset when he ended the long career of Rep. Lucille McCollough, the senator's mother.






Workers will be needed before the election to help prepare absentee ballots for mailing and to work in the clerk's office the night of the election.





How Eddie Edgar happened to come to Michigan

(Part I)

The Stroller, whose column used to run on the same page as mine, is no longer with us. He strolled off to greener pastures one day last month. I miss him, especially on Fridays.

Friday is the day the Plymouth Rotary Club meets. I would drop in at the Observer office on that day to chat with Eddie before we both went upstairs in the Mayflower Meeting House for the weekly Rotary meet-

ing. Eddie would be at his desk, typing with two fingers, under the framed picture of the turtle with the punchline: "Consider the turtle; he makes no progress until he sticks his neck out." When I entered he would say, "Sit down a minute, I have something to tell you."

Eddie had a never-ending fund of sports figures of the past; of the years he spent in Detroit trying to gain prestige for bowling; of his early days as a reporter in Pennsylvania. I enjoyed every one of them, and may well have been one of Eddie's best listeners.


I learned that he was born Wilson William Edgar in Catasauqua, Pa., in 1897. He was of Pennsylvania-Dutch and Scotch-Irish descent. His father, William Edgar, managed the town's baseball team and owned Catasaqua's only pool room. Baseball averages were posted on the wall. There was an adjoining six-stool seafood bar. Every morning, young Eddie had to sweep the floor, shuck the oysters, and wash the clams needed for the day's business. His mother did the cooking. I learned about the pies she used to bake, and

that you could buy a whole pie from her for less than a little sliver costs today. HIS FATHER TAUGHT him how

to use a pool cue. At the tender age of 9, Eddie, who

had to stand on a box to reach the stories: of his experiences with great table, was taking on all comers at pool. At 12, he won the Lehigh Valley pool championship.

Then, when Eddie was 13, his father died of TB. His mother tried to carry on the business but had to give up after two years. Eddie had to quit school after three months of his



freshman year to help support his mother and sisters.

His mother told him he should learn a trade. He became an apprentice machinist in the Atlas Portland Cement Co. at Northampton, Pa., at 55 cents a day, of which he had to pay 10 cents for carfare. After finishing four years apprenticeship, he became a master mechanic at Bethlehem Steel Works during World

War I. Later, he became night superintendent at the Lehigh Car Wheel and Axle Works. But he was not happy in his work. After one particularly trying day, he wrote out his resignation, packed his tool chest, opened a plant window and pitched it into the Lehigh River. He said he never stepped into a machine shop again.

Eddie happened to be in the office of a weekly newspaper one day when a police car whizzed past. The editor asked him to follow it, to see what happened. There had been an acci-

dent and Eddie came back and reported the facts. He had found his career - and it had something to do with printer's ink and bylines.

When that same editor was asked to organize a new paper in Allentown, four miles away, Eddie was one of seven he hired. There was no lack of stories to cover as New York was only 96 miles away, Philadelphia 52 miles.

Eddie began to write byline stories on championship events at Madison Square Garden, cover some of the East's top-flight football games, and meet outstanding luminaries in Eddie's move to Michigan from (To be continued).

the Golden Age of Sports.

He got his first big story in 1919 with an impromptu interview with William Jennings Bryan. Eddie met the silver-tongued orator on a railroad platform. Bryan said he never gave interviews because he was too often misquoted. Always persistent, Eddie said he might lose his job if he didn't get a story. Bryan took pity on the young man and wrote a threepage statement in long hand for him, saying that it had to be printed verbatim. Eddie rushed back to the paper and the story covered the front page.

EDDIE GOT HIS second break a few week's later during the 1920 presidential campaign.

Sent to interview Boise Penrose, the Mr. GOP of his time, Eddie was alone with the powerful politician in an Allentown Hospital room when Penrose placed the phone call that made Warren Harding president of the United States. "Better hurry back to your office," Penrose told Eddie. "Harding will be nominated

the Allentown Record came about because he happened to meet Edgar Guest. The poet of the Detroit Free Press was booked to lecture in Allentown. Eddie attended and spoke to Guest afterward. Guest was impressed and told him a metropolitan daily would be interested in his services. Encouraged, Eddie applied to the Free Press for a job.

When his mother heard that her son was contemplating a move to the big city she exacted a promise from him. He was never to drink hard liquor. He made the promise - and kept it for the rest of his life.

On Guest's recommendation, Harry Bullion, the paper's sports editor, gave Eddie a job as sportswriter at what Eddie throught was a huge salary, \$2,500 a year. But it was on a two-weeks trial basis. A quarter of a century later, when Eddie was leaving the Free Press, John S. Knight asked him why he was quitting. Eddie quipped: 'I've been waiting for someone to tell me my two weeks are up." His real reason will come out later.


Ah, but not for long - once again summer vacation is breathing down our necks and I, for one, am not at all thrilled about it.






SWEETS FOR THE EART

Safflower Oil Helps Cut Cholesterol, Calories In Favorite Desserts

Luscious ice cream, cakes and pies don't have to be off limits if you're on a heart-healthy diet. A variety of sweet treats that are truly rich and delicious tasting can be made simply by substituting healthful ingredients for harmful ones.

Eliminating butter, heavy cream, whole eggs and milk from desserts can virtually remove cholesterol and saturated fat while cutting calories significantly. The use of safflower oil is another stratagem. Its high polyunsaturate content helps reduce cholesterol and in comparison to shortening, it reduces calories in the chocolate orange cake and in the pie crust. For body and flavor the cake uses egg whites and cocoa instead of fat-filled butter and chocolate. The "creaminess" in the strawberry pie and vanilla ice cream comes from nonfat dry milk rather than heavy cream.

Next time you're aching for a sweet that's rich and forbidden, try one of these ideas. It will do your heart good!

- 1/2 cup nonfat dry milk
- 2 teaspoons grated orange peel
- 3 tablespoons safflower oil

Roll Whole Wheat Pastry between 2 sheets of wax paper into an 11- or 12-inch circle. Peel off top sheet of paper; invert pastry into an 8- or 9-inch pie pan; peel off remaining paper. Fit into pan. Flute edges and prick with fork tines. Refrigerate for 1 hour. Preheat oven to 400°F. Place a 12-inch square of aluminum foil on pastry: fill with dried beans or rice. Bake for 10 minutes. Remove foil and beans. Bake until firm, about 5 minutes. Set aside to cool. Hull strawberries. Place in the container of an electric blender. Whirl until smooth, stopping blender and scraping down sides of container if needed (makes 1-1/4 cups); set aside. Chill the small bowl and beaters of an electric mixer. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan combine 3/4 cup of the orange juice and sugar; sprinkle with gelatin. Soften for 1 minute. Stir over medium heat until sugar and gelatin are dissolved. Cool to room temperature. Place nonfat dry milk and remaining 1/2 cup orange juice in the chilled bowl. Beat at high speed until soft peaks form.

Slowly add gelatin mixture and orange peel; beat until smooth, about 2 minutes. Slowly beat in safflower oil. Fold in pureed strawberries. Refrigerate until mixture mounds on a spoon. Turn into baked pie shell. Refrigerate until firm. Garnish with strawberry halves and mint leaves, if desired. (Strawberry "Cream" filling can be spooned into dessert glasses instead of a pie shell.)







If Dangerfield "U" were open to all undergraduates, there would be no drop-outs. On the other hand, if skipping school were as much fun as Ferris and his friends had, truancy would be the nation's number one problem

In both cases, audiences benefit as Hollywood's vacation films turn their attention back to school days, ments, in counterpoint to Rooney's with two well done vehicles packed with good humor and pleasant characters.

"Ferris Bueller's Day Off" opens as he fools his parents, Katie (Cindy Pickett) and Tom Bueller (Lyman Ward). They fall for his fake illness. Not only is Ferris a great con artist, but they're both preoccupied with their own affairs - Katie is about to close a real-estate deal while Tom is selling a major ad campaign. Only sister Jeanie (Jennifer Grey) realizes Ferris is malingering.

High school dean of students Ed Rooney (Jeffrey Jones) suspects, but can't prove, Ferris is skipping school Jones screws up his face to



propel his determined but whacky chase of Ferris the Truant.


The dean is aided and abetted by his nutty secretary (Edie McClurg) whose innocent, round pixie face belies the devilish glee that lurks in her heart. Her softly muttered comresolute air and firm attitude, are extremely funny.

MCCLURG ALSO appears as Rodney Dangerfield's secretary, although in a much abbreviated role. In "Ferris Bueller" she shines with seemingly innocent comments about Ed Rooney's attempts to catch Ferris. Excellent supporting roles by McClurg, and others, greatly enrich both films.

While Rooney is self-destructing in his obsessive and very funny pursuit of Ferris, our hero cons his hypochondriacal buddy, Cameron Frye (Alan Ruck), into a madcap day driving the classic Ferrari that Camer-

Thornton decides to attend college and buoy up his son's spirits and records. Thornton has no high school transcript, just lots of money, so the dean (Ned Beatty) figures a new Bus-Ad School is the appropriate price of admission.

The business school dean, Philip Barbay (Paxton Whitehead), a gentleman with a marvelous sneer, a facial expression fixed in place from smelling sour fruit, has other ideas. His discomfiture is heightened when his paramour, literature professor Diane Turner (Sally Kellerman), takes a liking to Thornton.

Jason is also uncomfortable as his father spends money left and right, thus making college an entirely new experience. Jason's only friend is a clever satire of freshman Marxism, Derek (Robert Downey Jr.), complete with punk hair and a firm belief that Karl Marx wrote "Communist Chicks in Bondage."

Burt Young plays Thornton's chauffer bodyguard, Lou, with the same uncouth appeal that characterized his role as Rocky's brother-inlaw. In fact, "Back to School" is filled with a number of nifty characterizations that offset the Rodney Dangerfield persona, which only occasionally overwhelms the good-spirited proceedings. As long as Dangerfield plays Melon, he gets my respect. Only when Dangerfield surfaces do things get sticky.

There's a little bit of kid in every adult, and vice versa, so these two well-done, realistic satires ought to please every audience with their good humor, pleasant entertainment and mild swipes at all our foibles.



Lectka's no-hitter wins title for Franklin

It's time to update the big sign that stands above the entrance to Livonia Franklin High School - you know, the one that proclaims Franklin as the winner of the 1975 state Class A football championship. The new sign should say: "Livonia

Franklin: Home of the 1986 Class A girls softball champions." And somewhere on the sign should be a picture of Tracy Lectka.

The Patriots earned the new distinction Saturday at Lansing's Ran-ney Park, beating Waterford Kettering 1-0. Earlier Saturday, the Pats closed out a 20-inning marathon semifinal session with South Lyon, winning 2-0.

It took 'em 27 innings, but the title belongs to the Pats.

Now, what's all this about Tracy Lectka? Was she a one-girl show, or what?

Not entirely - the Franklin squad played superlative defense - but

HERE'S WHAT Lectka accomplished in the state tournament. She tossed a no-hitter at Kettering. The only Kettering runner reached base on a sixth inning error. This was just hours after wrapping up 20 scoreless innings against South Lyon. In that game, she allowed just eight hits, six

of which came between the 11th and 17th innings Friday night. Only two runners reached third base, she struck out nine, walked only one, and made 14 assists on ground balls back to the mound.

Impressed?

There's more.

Going back to the district tournament, Lectka tossed 44 consecutive scoreless innings. The last run scored off the senior came in the fourth inning of the district finale against Farmington Hills Mercy.

Her performance in the state championship game provided a story-book ending to Lectka's softball career. Next year, Lectka will play basketball at Wayne State, not soft-

'We just played awesome," said a teary-eyed Lectka. "I love it. This is

SAID FRANKLIN coach Joe Epstein: "The girls were just something else. But it's like I've said all year, if we can score three runs, Tracy will win it. She got fired up early this morning when I told the news that she made first team all-state. And we fielded very well behind her."
