> PROPOSAL I, if approved would allow the renewal of 10.36 mills (\$10.36 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation or SEV) for 10 years. The 10.36 mills is now being levied

The renewal represents 28 percent of the school district's total operating hudget. If defeated, the district would lose almost \$11 million.

If approved, the renewal in itself would not result in any tax increase.

The 1086 mills expired in 1986, and voters must approve continuing

PROPOSAL II is the result of the Headlee Amendment to the Michigan Constitution.

The Headlee amendment provides school districts and municipalities must get voter approval to collect its full authorized levy whenever the value of the property in the district increases faster than than the cost of

Since the Headlee amendment was passed, the school district has had to seek voter approval twice to collect the full authorized levy. In 1980 approval was given; in 1981, it was de-

The district collects taxes of 37 mills and would continue to if both proposals were approved

School officials aren't sure yet how much they would have to reduce the tax rate by if Proposal II does not pass because they don't yet know the district's total value Municipalities don't have to report their SEV totals until March 1 and so the district won't know how much SEV exceeds cost of living until sometime after that

ESTIMATES ARE that the district will have to reduce the 37 mills by between a quarter to a half-mill if regular school district voting loca-Proposal II is defeated.







A native of Chicago, Klicar earned a bachelor of science degree in zoology from Roosevelt University in

After attending graduate school, he served four years as a Naval officer in Europe and the Far East, including a tour of duty in Vietnam. He entered the film lecture field in 1967 while a Navy public relations officer.

He since has produced several full-length documentaries.

WHEN NOT on the lecture circuit, Klicar works as a public relations consultant for conservation and environmental organization and remains active in the U.S. Naval Re-

Klicar's wife Ann, a sales-marketing executive and photographer, as-

sists in the production of the films.

Part one of Wednesday night's film includes scenes from Bombay, the nature of Hinduism, Madras and the beginnings of British India, the tomb of St. Thomas the Apostle, crocodiles and cobras, early Hindu temples, the erotic temples of Khaju-raho, Maduri (the city of ahrines), schools of sculpture and classical dance, village industries developed by Gandhi, the spice merchants of Malabar, harvesting coffee and tea, wildlife conservation, fishing villages and the sacred River Ganges.



### Yearly wages

### Top school administrators earn more than \$60,000

The top four administrators for the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools now have annual base sala-

ries in excess of \$60,000.
Superintendent John M. Hoben, not surprisingly, heads the list with a yearly salary of \$79,516. The district also provides Hoben with a \$6,000 car allowance annually plus mileage reimbursement for business trips.

Raymond Hoedel, associate superintendent for business, has a base salary of \$64,076. Michael Homes, assistant superintendent for instruction, and Norman Kee, assistant superintendent for employee relations, each has a base salary of \$62,146.

Hoedel, Homes and Kee also receive mileage reimbursement.

Dale Goby, director of transportation, has a base salary of \$52,384 and Dan Menghini, director of maintenance and operations, \$46,772.

THOSE INDIVIDUALS, as well as all other administrators in the district, receive annual longevity bonuses of \$250 to \$500 depending on

length of service if they have at least 10 years with the district. Kee provided the figures.

Nearly 820 Plymouth-Canton teachers, counselors and other certified staff are represented by the Michigan Education Association, the largest union in the district.

A teacher with a bachelor's degree and no experience would now hire in at \$18,696 per year, a master's degree and no experience, \$20,454.

A teacher with a bachelor's degree

and five years experience is now paid \$25,543, a master's degree and five years, \$28,459.

A teacher with a bachelor's degree and 10 years experience is now paid \$32,889, a master's degree and 10 years, \$36,295.

THERE ARE other step levels. A majority of teachers can't be found in any single level, Kee said. Fewer than half hold master's degrees. A teacher's work year consists of

39 weeks. Teachers also receive annual

longevity pay ranging from \$250 to \$750 based on years of service after

Teachers with at least 10 years of service receive a bonus of \$100 per year of service up to \$3,000 at retire-

Custodial and maintenance employees also are represented by an arm of the MEA. There are about 130 in the unit, the second largest in the district.

Pay rates, based on job classification, now range from \$11.67 to \$7.69 per hour.

Five bonus vacation days can be earned with perfect attendance, few-

EDUCATIONAL AIDES who assist in classrooms, lunchrooms, libraries, offices and on playgrounds also are represented by the MEA. This union group, third largest in the district, has 108 members, Kee said.

Their hourly pay rate now ranges from \$6.17 for study hall aides to \$4.61 for library aides. Teacher/office aides are paid \$5.01 per hour.

Secretaries, numbering about 97, form the fourth largest unionized employee group in the district, Kee said. They're represented as the Plymouth-Canton Association of Educational Office Personnel.

Secretaries, depending on classifi-cation and years of service, are now paid \$10.06 to \$6.78 per hour

Secretaries also receive annual longevity pay of 1 to 5 percent of wages after seven years. They can earn two extra vacation days per year with perfect attendance.

Secretaries also receive the same retirement bonus as teachers.

THE DISTRICT'S bus drivers, special education monitors and mechanics are represented by The Transportation Employees Association.

A first-year driver now makes \$7.75 per hour, all others \$9.04. Hourly pay for special ed monitors ranges from \$6.17 to \$4.80. Mechanics are paid 11.28 to \$5.20. About 75 cafeteria workers are

represented by an arm of the MEA. Starting pay, depending on classifi-cation, ranges from \$6.44 to \$4.43 per hour. After two years, pay ranges from \$9.21 to \$4.83.

Longevity pay of \$100 to \$400 annually is paid after five years of ser-

Principals, assistant principals, area coordinators, athletic directors and directors of special education, vocational education and adult edu-cation are unionized under the Plym; outh-Canton Administrators.

THEIR SALARIES are based on a factor that reflects the degree of dif-ficulty of the administrative position and the experience of the adminis-trator applied to a negotiated base

### Local commitment needed in drug fight

President Reagan's tight-fisted budget proposal to cut anti-drug spending has met with varied reponses among Plymouth-Canton agency leaders who are involved in the fight against substance abuse.

Dollars are important, they say, but local commitment and resources go a long way, too.

Under the President's budget, aid to states and cities for drug treatment, education and law enforcement would be cut from \$675 million last year to \$100 million in the next fiscal year.

THE CUT would eliminate most of the federal anti-drug aid to cities and states that was approved as part of an omnibus drug bill last year.

"It would be nice to see that money but I didn't get too excited when it happened,"said Dave Yagiela, executive director of Growth Works Inc., a youth assistance program in Plymouth. "I see funding extended

and taken back. I don't know what the motivation was" for Reagan's cutbacks.

"Federal money is often 'funny money.' It comes with restrictions, doesn't always fullfill the objectives set up in the first place and doesn't take into consideration what the community needs."

Growth Works operates several youth programs that deal with "the issues that inflict and affect young people" age 13-18 (diversion, alternative education and drugs). This includes an after-care drug relapse prevention program, which aids about 100 youth annually and is paid for out-of-pocket, and an employment assistance program.

Growth Works has been active in the community for the last 16 years,

Yagiela said the agency has never seen any federal anti-drug money, and he doesn't believe any other area agency ever has either.

Growth Works receives money for its programs locally from the Plymouth Community Fund and Plym-

outh-Canton Schools, and it has an employment contract with the city, said Yagiela. Local money is more accountable than federal money, he

needs.'

"In the metropolitan Detroit area, drugs are a big problem. There is a whole set of juvenile system problems that are interrelated with the drug problem."

MATT MURPHY, director of

Straight Inc., a private non-profit adolescent drug treatment program in Plymouth Township, had similar

"If people want help, they can usually get it if they are highly motivated. I recognize the fact that we have to do some belt-tightening.

He added that he does not favor the reduction of federal money for anti-drug programs but said that on a self-help approach.

"Parents of our clients do a tremendous amount of fund raising. We don't have a gymnasium and color TVs like you see in some federally funded programs."

According to Murphy, Straight Inc. recently received a letter from the White House that commended the group for its self-help approach. The agency has 80-85 drug-addicted patients in treatment, averaging 120-130 patients per year some of which are referred elsewhere, he

"We're busier than ever now." Last year Straight Inc., "graduated" 35 patients, Murphy said.

Neither Yagiela nor Murphy felt Reagan was neccesarily backing away from his and First Lady Nancy Reagan's much verbalized "Just Say No" anti-drug campaign.

The Plymouth Community Fund donated \$76,000 to Growth Works and \$89,500 to Plymouth Family Service from its 1987 budget, according to Clarence DuCharme, executive director. DuCharme also is treasurer of the Plymouth-Canton Substance Abuse Task Force, which meets the second Friday of every month in the Canton Library conference room.

The Plymouth Community Fund also has donated \$12,500 to the Task Force in the last two years, he said.





### Area schools divided on tax shift's merits

By Wayne Peal staff writer

No local school districts would benefit from the state-supported \$3,000 minimum per-pupil expense outlined in a new tax proposal.

But that doesn't mean the propos-

al - which would raise the state sales tax to 6 percent while cutting property taxes - is without local support.

Even though all local districts currently spend more than \$3,000 per student, some local school officials — particularly those in small dis-tricts — see the proposal as a positive step toward equalizing education costs.

"Any type of tax reform that would reduce the inequity (of per-pu-pil spending) I'm in favor of," Clarenceville Superintendent Michael Shibler said.

OFFICIALS IN Redford Union, another of the area's smaller districts, have long advocated finding alternative funding sources.

While unfamiliar with the latest proposal, district officials said it was at least worth examining.

"Without having seen it, I would say we are generally supportive of any program that would move support away from the property tax," RU Superintendent Kenneth Erickson said. "We are not a property-rich district."

Officials from some larger school

though doubted whether it would benefit them.

'Any increase in sales tax would go a long way toward equalizing funding," said Livonia Schools busi-ness director Michael Furlong, "But we're a long way from qualifyli

As an out-of-formula district, Livonia currently receives no state aid for general educational ex-

But everyone was enthusiastic. Some school officials are looking for hidden traps.

"Our concern is that we haven't seen it yet," South Redford Superintendent Jan Jacobs said. "It could be something like the new federal tax law — something that sounds good at first but which causes concerns when you read all the way through

The tax proposal was contained in a Michigan Citizens Property Tax Commission study released Tuesday. The 15-member commission was applied to the control of pointed by Sen. THE PROPOSED \$3,000 minimum per-pupil expenditure includes all costs — including teacher salaries — involved in proving a year's

education to any particular student.

Districts with heavy industrial or commercial base generally spend more per pupil than less endowed communities.

Among local districts, per-pupil spending varies from Plymouoth-Canton's \$3,159 per student to South Redford's \$4,517. Per pupil spending for most local schools falls within the \$3,300-\$3,600 range. (For figures, see related chart.)

The report also suggests asking voters to increase the state sales tax from 4 to 6 percent in return for property tax cuts. Supporters said average school taxes could be rolled back from 32 mills to 17-18 mills if the sales tax increase was approved.

The commission also suggested:

• Lowering Homestead Property Tax Credit income eligibility from \$73,650 to \$30,000.

 Studying whether tax abatements spur expansion and limiting business tax breaks seven years rather than the current 12-year maximum - unless the development would have regional economic im-

### Western Wayne council backs triple bunking

By Wayne Peal staff writer

Will it be three's company in the new Wayne County Jail?

Sheriff Robert Ficano is stumping for triple bunking of prisoners, saying the 2%-year-old facility is filled to capacity.

According to Ficano, roughly 800 prisoners — including 500 felons should have been housed at the jail since September, but weren't because space wasn't available.

Triple bunking, the sheriff said, is the quickest, most cost-effective, means of expanding jail capacity.

Agreeing with Ficane, the Council of Western Wayne endorsed triple bunking Friday. Council members said they would lobby state and county officials on the proposal's be-half. The council includes govern-mental representatives from Garden City, Livonia, Plymouth, Westland and Canton, Plymouth and Redford townships, among western Wayne County communities.

THE AMERICAN Civil Liberties Union, however, has criticized the

And at this point, it isn't certain whether state officials will agree with either group.

While an exact price tag hasn't been established, Ficano said it cost roughly \$350,000 when jail cells were recently converted for double

County commissioners would have to approve funding, though rejection from the Michigan Corrections Com-

But Picano said state Rep. Justine Barns, D-Westland, seeks an attorney general's opinion on whether state corrections officials can regulate the county facility.

Ficano acknowledged that triple bunking could increase prisoner as-

"There's always a possibility inmates may assault one another," he said. "But a lot of people in our jail are awaiting trial. That sometimes keeps them restrained. Once they've probably feel they've got nothing to

Prisoners with records of assaultive or homosexual behavior would be transferred to the old county jail

which features single-bunk cells Ficano said.

Presoners are not confined to their cells all day, according to the sher-





### Plymouth 70 years ago — Markham's wooden gun

Four factories were located on or near the Pere Marquette Railroad tracks in March 1916 when the Plymouth Mail published its Booster Edition. They were the Markham Manufacturing Co. on Main Street, the Daisy Manufacturing Co. on Union Avenue, C.J. Hamilton and Son's on Hamilton Street, and the Alter Motor Car plant on Farmer Street.

All of these firms began business here after the railroads crossed each other in Plymouth in 1871. Markham began manufacturing in 1885, Daisy in 1889 (although its predecessor, the Plymouth Iron Windmill Company had begun earlier), Hamilton in 1899 and Alter in 1914.

THE PERE Marquette name, itself, was not a household word here until 1900. That was the year it was formed as a merger of the Flint and Pere Marquette and other railroads that preceded it.



tion men also resided in Plymouth. The Plymouth payroll of the Pere Marquette in 1916 amounted to \$7.763 a month.

Two local freight train crews and six extra crews tied up here every night. Twenty extra train crews passed through Plymouth every 24 hours, getting their meals at the railroad restaurants here. Eighteen passenger trains were in and out of Plymouth, four ways, every day, giving the community a standard of train service that was never surpassed here and which began to diminish as the automobile began to elbow its way into the transportation

On an average of 60 cars of livestock were fed in the Plymouth yards every week. All in all, the Mail noted that Pere Marquette officials were kindly disposed toward the community of Plymouth. Of the three remaining, the Markham firm was the first of the group to be established here and the first in the nation to produce and sell inexpensive "toy" rifles for use by boys. The founder of the firm, W.F. Markham, was born in England on Jan. 22, 1851, the year Nathaniel Hawthorne wrote "The House of Seven Gables."

The company Markham formed in Plymouth first produced wooden products including troughs and cisterns used for watering livestock. With that background, it is not surprising that the first air rifle he produced was made of wood.

Markham is said to have conceived the idea of using compressed air as an expelling force for

projectiles in a wooden rifle in 1880. His patent was not issued until August 1887 but he began making the guns in 1885, three years before Daisy got into the business.

His competitors at Daisy later tended to downplay Markham's achievement and his wooden air-gun. Charley Bennett called the rifle more of a nightmare than a dream. Cass Hough said it resembled anything but a gun and that many of Markham's neighbors said the patent should have gone to one of his workmen rather than to him. But other sources say that, although primitive by today's standards, the Markham air-gun was remarkably accurate.
Coello Hamilton described the

Markham rifle to me when I interviewed him in 1967: "It was a wooden rifle with a brass cylinder. It had a hinge at the end of the air chamber. You put a BB in and drew the plunger back to fire. It was a strong

MARKHAM'S WOODEN gun found favor with a large distributor in Chicago and it was thereafter called "the Chicago." The firm continued to produce it

long after those made of steel made their appearance. For reasons not pertinent to this article, in 1912 Phil Markham decided to pick up stakes and move to California.

On Dec. 31, 1912, he sold 90 percent of his stock in the Markham Co. to two of the principals in the Daisy Manufacturing Co., Edward C. Hough and Charles H. Bennett. But for some reason he retained 10 percent and the firm was still known as the Markham Air Rifle Company in 1916 when the Plymouth Mail issued its Booster Edition.

When Markham left for the west coast, he left E.S. Roe, vice president and superintendent of the firm, in charge. Evered V. Jolliffe was secretary and sales manager. Ernie Roe had been with Markham since the firm started; the Mail said he

was the "oldest man connected with the air-gun industry here" in 1916. The article took no note of the deal made with Hough and Bennett four years earlier — perhaps all of the principals had reasons for keeping it. under wraps.

Between the two firms they had 90 percent of the air rifle business in the world, and government officials might not have taken kindly to the transaction. In addition, Daisy maynot have wanted the purchase made, known in the trade. In his book, "It's A Daisy!," Cass Hough wrote that after Daisy got control of Markham as policy was laid out by which "King". rifles made in the Markham plant; would be sold to Sears Roebuck & Co. and Montgomery Ward, but werenot to be sold by Daisy.

Whatever the reason, both the Daisy and the Markham firms had separate ads in the Mail's 1916 Booster edition, and the article in the paper. indicated that Phil Markham was still president of the firm bearing hisname "although for the past threeyears he has been a resident of Cali-


nificant factor in our turnaround. Ken's come a long way in a short period of time. When he does make a mistake now, I get all over him because I'm so surprised to see him make one







Inspires Two Hearty Supper Dishes



Stuffed Pork Loin from the Midwest and Louisiana-style Roast Chicken with Jambalaya Rice are updated versions of two American regional classics.

#### Roast Chicken With Jambalaya Rice

- 1 cup chicken broth
- 2 ounces Polish sausage (kielbasa), chopped
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
- 1/4 cup chopped red pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon garlic salt 3 dashes hot pepper sauce
- 1/8 teaspoon thyme leaves
  - cup packaged enriched pre-cooked rice
  - 1 cup chopped fresh tomatoes
  - 4 chicken breast halves
  - Pepper **Butter or margarine**

Combine broth, sausage, onion, green and red peppers, garlic salt, hot pepper sauce and thyme in a saucepan. Bring to a full boil. Stir in rice. Cover; remove from heat. Let stand 5 minutes. Stir in tomatoes.

Spoon rice mixture into bottom of 4 individual baking dishes. Sprinkle chicken lightly with pepper. Place chicken on top of rice mixture. Dot with butter and bake at 350° for 45 to 50 minutes until chicken is golden brown.

Makes 4 servings.

#### Stuffed Pork Loin

- 1/3 cup chopped scallions
- garlic clove, minced
- 2 tablespoons oil package (10 oz.) frozen chopped spinach, thawed
- 2 eggs, slightly beaten
- package (6 oz.) stuffing mix with savory herbs 2-pound boneless pork loin, untied and flattened
- 1 cup apple butter

Saute scallions and garlic in oil until tender but not browned. about 2 minutes. Stir in spinach and cook until heated through.

Remove from heat and cool slightly. Stir in eggs, vegetable/ seasoning packet and stuffing crumbs. Spread mixture evenly over inside of pork loin. Roll up and tie with twine.

Place in roasting pan and roast at 400° for 10 minutes. Remove from oven and coat meat with 1/4 cup of the apple butter; add 1/2 cup water to bottom of pan. Cover and roast at 350° for 45 minutes. Add more water if pan becomes dry during roasting. Remove from oven and spread remaining apple butter on meat and continue roasting uncovered 25 minutes longer or to an internal temperature of 160°. Let stand 15 minutes before slicing.

Makes 8 servings.

ately, down-home American cooking has provided the culinary inspiration for some of America's best-known chefs. "The immense interest in American regional cuisine has given young American chefs the freedom to draw on their own culinary roots to come up with appealing new twists on classic American favorites, says Chef Blake Emerson Swihart, an Indiana native and graduate of The Culinary Institute of America.

"Re-experiencing foods that we loved as kids is a source of comfort for most of us," says the chef, in explaining the popularity of some of the foods that have been out of fashion until recently. "We all need a touch of nostalgia now and then to make it easier to cope in this increasingly complex world."

Chef Swihart combined his culinary training with his love for the foods his Indiana grandmother served at family gatherings to come up with an updated recipe for Stuffed Pork Loin.

Ideal fare for a cold-weather family supper, the pork loin is roasted with a savory herb and spinach stuffing and is glazed with apple butter. "Pork and apples are a traditional combination in Indiana's Amish country, where I grew up, and everyone in my family loved apple butter, says Chef Swihart.

"Although I love old-fashioned dishes, like most people today. I don't have the time for meal preparation that my grandmother had, so I rely on good-quality convenience foods to help save time when I cook," he says. For the pork loin, he uses frozen chopped spinach and packaged stuffing mix with savory herbs to make a quick and tasty stuffing which is spread over the inside of the pork loin before rolling, tying and roasting the meat.

Southern Louisiana cooking, with its Creole and Cajun influences, was the inspiration for another timesaving recipe of Chef Swihart, Roast Chicken with Jambalaya Rice.

captures The rice mixture, smoky, spicy flavors favored by Louisiana cooks. In it, Polish sausage is used as a substitute for andouille, the Cajun smoked sausage.

The sausage, along with chopped onions, chopped red and green peppers, spices and hot pepper sauce, is added to chicken broth, which is brought to a boil. Minute rice is added to the broth and left to stand for 5 minutes. Then chopped tomatoes are added and the mixture is spooned into individual baking dishes. Chicken breast halves are placed on top and the dishes are baked in the oven until the chicken is golden brown. The result is an exceptionally flavorful concoction that could well become one of your own family classics.



### Reducing recipes makes cooking for 2 easy

People who may be willing to make a healthy complete meal for others seldom put the same effort into cooking for themselves.

Just as with larger families, cooking for one or two requires advance planning to create tempting and nutritious meals. Get variety into meals. Try something new, especially if you're eating alone.

Most recipes are planned to serve four to six people. Many of these can be reduced to one-half or one-third to serve two people. It is often more advantageous to cut the recipe in half rather than thirds. Sometimes it's harder to work with the smaller amount. Cooking time may need to be shortened because of the smaller quantity in the pots and pans.

When you divide a recipe, translate the amounts into equivalent measures. For example, one-third cup can be divided easily if you know that it equals five tablespoons plus one teaspoon, or 16 teaspoons; half of this would be two tablespoons plus two teaspoons, or eight teaspoons.

the equivalents listed. One problem in division that may puzzle you is how to halve an egg. There are two ways of doing this: either use a very small egg or break the egg into a cup, beat slightly, then divide in half for your recipe. Cover the remainder and store in refrigerator for another dish.

Depending on the size of the egg, one egg usually yields about four tablespoons. A little more egg than the recipe calls for generally will not do any harm.

With yeast dough it is advisable to When you figure these equivalents, use a larger quantity of yeast. If the you are cutting it down to one-third or one-half, it would be wise to use the whole yeast cake or the greater part of it to hasten the process. Bread recipes that require no kneading are easier to handle in small

Buy carefully to avoid waste, save storage space, and make small-scale cooking and serving easy. As a quick buying guide for meat and poultry with lots of bones, you should figure one pound equals two servings. One pound of fish fillets or meat with a little bone makes three servings.

Instead of a large beef roast, buy a thick steak, roll and tie for roasting. Leftovers can always be used in another dish. Broiling is a quick and

easy method to use when preparing cooking for one or two. Many recip small quantities of meat.

Buy fresh cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussel sprouts in regular amounts. Cut off or separate enough for one meal, cover and refrigerate the remainder to cook within a day or two. Larger size bags of frozen vegetables are excellent for one or more persons, pour out enough for one meal and return to the freezer

Regular loaves of bread can be purchased and kept in the freezer. Keep a couple different kinds on hand to add variety to meals. To avoid soggy crust or bread, double wrap the loaf before freezing. Save the used plastic bread bag and slip the new loaf into that as a double thickness.

If desserts are a puzzle, make individual custard cups or a cup large enough to serve two. It's as easy to make one cup of custard or gelatin as it is to make a quart. Individual tarts can be made in muffin tins or as turnovers that are just large enough to serve one or two people and add variation in form.

Leftovers can be a problem when

can be made in full amounts and lef-

tovers reheated for several days. Freeze leftover meat and casseroles in individual containers for convenient cooking later. Stir a few tablespoons of sour cream into heated leftover gravy to give it new zest or use a dash of curry in gravy for a new tasty treat.

Leftover vegetables can be "recycled" successfully by adding some diced cheese to melt into a delicious glaze. Add leftover corn kernels to pancake batter to make corn cakes or fritters. Mix bread crumbs or croutons with a little melted margarine or butter and sprinkle over vegetables to create a new interest. Freeze little packages of leftovers to use in soup or stew later.

Leftover cake can be broiled and then topped with ice cream or lemon sauce. Line a loaf pan or pie plate with strips of leftover cake, spread with softened ice cream; freeze. You have dessert ready when company drops in!

Use one recipe in different ways. Baking powder biscuit dough will make shortcake for one meal; toast-

bake flat, cover with cinnamon and sugar for a flat bread or rolled up to make a coffee cake. Pie doughs will make pies or tart shells for meat

dishes or dessert. If you don't enjoy eating solo, invite a friend or neighbor over at mealtime on a regular basis. Overindulging is an easy trap to fall into

when you are alone. To avoid this, don't keep irresistible goodies around the house. If your recipe serves two or more, one serving should go on the plate and the rest stored in the refrigerator or freezer so you're not tempted to nib-

Create interest in meals by using attractive place mats or trays. Choose a pleasant spot to eat, perhaps by a window. Pay attention to how the food looks on the plate. Whether you are cooking for one, two, or ten, food taste better if it looks good!



### Stars don't glitter in dull films

"I can't complain," says Benjamin Rasnick (Jason Miller), nominal head of the quarrelsome family whose affairs are the centerpiece of

"Light of Day" (PG-13). With all due respect to Rasnick, I can, and will, complain, about this poor excuse for entertainment, a motion picture that gives new meaning to the terms, "dull," "leaden" and "boring."

Throw in "confusing" and "poorly structured," and you have, as well, a good description of another major motion picture, "Black Widow" (R).

Both films feature major stars, Debra Winger and Michael J. Fox, and both films are remarkably weak, unpleasant experiences.

IT REALLY is quite amazing that people with the intelligence and business acumen to gather \$10 million or \$20 million to finance a motion picture aren't smart enough to produce a film that makes sense.

It may be difficult to entertain moviegoers, but it shouldn't be too hard to explain what happens in a story and why characters act as they

"Black Widow" and "Light of Day," however, quickly prove me wrong, with their poorly structured plots, unanswered questions and gaping loopholes. By comparison, swiss cheese looks solid.

The Rasnick family, whose maudlin melodrama clouds the "Light of Day," showcases rock star Joan Jett as sister Patti who can't get along with her mother, Jeanette (Gena Rowlands). While father Rasnick mopes around in terminal silence, brother Joe (Michael J. Fox) sporadically tries to keep things moving and prevent the family from congealing in a leaden mass of inac-

IN THE EVENINGS, Joe and Patti lead a rock band, playing bars in Cleveland to brighten their dull lives. That may not be the answer.

One of the reasons for motherdaughter antagonism is Patti's illegitimate son, Benji (Billy Sullivan). The film's biggest surprise, and most

end of this interminable two hours when Patti reveals the name of Ben-

ji's father. By that time no one cares. One of the film's problems is that the guilty party plays a major role in the plot, with few lines, very little screen time and no evidence of acting ability.

Some explanation for Patti's rebellion might have helped. It also would be nice to know why writerdirector Paul Schrader thinks audiences care about a family of inept dullards with tedious friend

The film could be shortened dramatically by directing actors to de-liver their lines with some speed and energy and by eliminating extensive establishing shots in Cleveland. We've heard all the jokes about how dull it is there — second prize is two weeks in Toledo, so lets get on with

"LIGHT OF DAY'S" numerous musical numbers have energy. If you like that sort of stuff, cut the rest of the film and play Michael J. Fox/ Joan Jett rock numbers on MTV. Actually, I preferred the Elvis played during intermission.

"Black Widow," on the other hand, had potential, with interesting characters involved in tense, energetic activities. The potential was unfulfilled, and the film remains a prime example of confusion compounded by unexplained facts and irrelevant details and plot developments. Talk about swiss cheese . .

Winger is an offbeat Justice Denartment investigator curious about mysterious deaths of wealthy, middle-aged men. As it turns out, Theresa Russell is the femme fatale who zips around the country seducing, marrying and murdering wealthy old goats after carefully rewriting their wills. This "Black Widow, however, is so clever that after the gentlemen die, the local coroners certify "natural causes."

Winger is obsessed with these deaths and takes a leave of absence to track down their perpetrator. Naturally, she does and, in one of film history's most confusing and


least comprehensible denouements, traps the "Black Widow."

THE FILM, which was faltering all the way, falls completely on its face at this ridiculous ending. Neither space nor energy permit a detailed explanation of the foolishness with which the plot terminates.

The fascination of old men for young, sensuous women, the "Black Widow's" obsession for money, Debra Winger's intense need to track and destroy evil, and the attraction

of two very different women for, each other - all these powerful motivations are glossed over or left unexplored.

"Black Widow" and "Light of Day" both deserve contempt. Only by voting at the box office can you send a message to producers who think that liberal doses of slick images and rock music are the only secrets of success. Save your money and don't support filmmakers unwilling, or unable, to tell understandable, entertaining stories.


3. Avoid abbreviations. Don't make a potential customer work too hard! 
