Water rates won't go up

Wholesale water and sewer rates for residential consumers in Plymouth Township, Canton and the city of Plymouth probably will remain the same this year as last.

At least that's the recommendation of Detroit Water and Sewage Department administrators.

A hold-the-line stance effective July 1 would follow wholesale increases last year and decreases in

Unusually high water use resulting in more revenue during last summer's drought was a big factor in the administrative recommendation to maintain wholesale rates, said William Carney, financial manager for Detroit's Water and Sewage Depart-

"We don't need an increase," Carney said. "We had a very good summer. We sold a lot of water.

"We're making a concerted effort to contain our costs - management controls, tight budgeting," he added.

THE DETROIT City Council will make the final decision on wholesale rates after getting a recommendation from the Detroit Board of Water Commissioners. Both bodies will conduct a public hearing on the is-

Ice festival expected to draw 200,000

You've got the questions and we've got the answers about the seventh annual Plymouth Ice Sculpture Spectacular today through Jan. 15 in downtown Plymouth. Weather permitting, of course.

O.K. How did the extravaganza get started?

Listen to Scott Lorenz, co-chairman of the event and general manager of the Mayflower Hotel.

"Seven years ago, I saw a story on '60 Minutes' about the Sapporo (Japan) Ice Show. I got hold of Mr. (Henry) Graper (city manager) and my father (Ralph Lorenz) and said: 'If they can do it there, why can't we do it here?'

"We contacted Schoolcraft College and put it on in 45 days. It was modest, in Kellogg Park. It was received exceptionally well."

A couple hundred thousand are expected during the run of this year's extravaganza.

So when is the best time to show up to avoid the throngs?

"Avoid Sunday afternoons at all cost," Lorenz said. "The best time . . to not get caught up in traffic is mornings before 11 o'clock and after 9, 10 o'clock at night.

The best photos are at night and the first thing in the morning at sunrise," he said.

Keep in mind that traffic will be rerouted around Kellogg Park Saturdays and Sundays. The Main-Ann Arbor Trail and Main-Penniman intersections will be closed to motorists both weekends of the show.

What about other amenities?

Bowled over

Sunshine, blue skies greet band members in Miami

Everything came up oranges for the Centennial Educational Park Marching Band in Miami New

Year's Eve. More than 160 musicians from Plymouth Canton and Salem high schools performed in the televised Orange Bowl parade, playing and marching to the "Mickey Mouse March" as well as "76 Trombones" and other hits from the "Music

The CEP band has won state championship honors four of the past five years, and was one of just 10 high school bands invited to the Orange Bowl.

Tyburski called 'friendly,' 'nice'

Neighbors of Leonard Tyburski described him as "outgoing,"
"friendly" and "really a nice guy"
Tuesday, while a police detective
said in court that the 45-year-old
Canton man admitted to having

killed his wife three years ago. Tyburski entered the 35th District Court with stubble on his face and his hands jammed into the pockets of a navy blue coat. He faces a charge of open murder in the death of Dorothy Tyburski, who was 37 years old

when she disappeared in September

An autopsy performed Wednesday attributed the cause of death to "multiple blunt blows to the head



to stand trial and capacity to com-mit the crime." The suspect was re-manded to the Wayne County Jail.

Tyburski was arrested after his 19-year-old daughter found the body and reported it to police. After he was questioned and the home searched, he "made a statement to the effect" that he had killed his wife, Canton police Detective Rick Pomorski testified in court.

Canton police Lt. Larry Stewart said later Tyburski confessed after being told the body had been discovered.

TYBURSKI TOLD investigators he killed his wife by hitting her head

against a pipe in the basement on Sept. 28, 1985, according to Stewart. On Avon Street in Canton, where the couple had lived with their two daughters, there was more traffic than usual Tuesday, the morning af-ter Dorothy Tyburski's body was dis-covered in a freezer in the basement.

A truck sporting the call letters of a Detroit television station was parked across from the single-story home, and passers-by slowed their cars as they drove by the house.

"Usually nothing goes on here," said Linda Ploucha, an Ayon Street resident who said she had been good friends with Dorothy Tyburski.

Another Avon Street resident, who oke on the condition of anonymity, id everyone in the residential

last night," the woman said Tuesday. TYBURSKI, WHO worked at Mackenzie High School in Detroit, was called "a very quiet person" by

"He's really a nice guy," she said.
"Nobody believes he would do a thing like-that."

Neighbors said Leonard Tyburski told them in September 1985 his wife had deserted the family. He filed a missing person report with Canton police at the time.

Police had been told a relationship existed between Dorothy Tyburski and her daughter's boyfriend. Stew-art said Monday he didn't know if that had anything to do with the murder case.

"I always had questions about why she would leave, why she wouldn't show up for her daughter's graduation. Now I know she couldn't," said

The victim's car and clothes remained at the house after she was reported missing, Ploucha said, but

when asked about the circumstances surrounding his wife's disappear-

Both women said the couple had marital problems. One said after Dorothy Tyburski disappeared, her husband "seemed to open up more and become friendly with the neigh-

The body, which was fully clothed and intact, was discovered after Tyburski's daughter pried open the locked freezer. She told police she was prompted to look in the freezer after having dreams about her mother being in confined places.

The young woman, home for the holidays from Michigan State University, and her teenage sister are staying with a relative who lives in the area, Stewart said.

TYBURSKI DECLINED Garber's offer of a court-appointed attorney, saying he thought he would be able to afford to hire one himself.

Garber also told the suspect that if he is found guilty, "It could mean that you could spend the rest of your natural life in jail."

A Detroit school district spokeswoman said Tyburski was department head of the attendance center at Mackenzie.

Plymouth house destroyed by fire

Plymouth firefighters are inves-tigating a fire that destroyed a home New Year's Day morning at 589, Providence Town Lane in the New England subdivision near Sheldon and North Territorial.

Plymouth Fire Chief Alan Matthews said the fire was reported at 3:04 a.m., as a New Year's Eve party was under way at the residence of Marilyn Potter and her son, Jason, 17.

When firefighters arrived, the place was totally involved in smoke. Upon entering the house, they found extensive fire in the basement area.

"At this time, we believe the area of origin of fire was in the basement near the gas meter," Matthews said.

Candles had been burning in the basement during the party, Matthews said.

Marilyn Potter was taken to St. Mary Hospital where she was treated for smoke inhalation and released.

Her son, who was entertaining

out, was cut on the arm.

Officials surmise there was a gas

"If you have a leak, whether it be in the gas line or in the meter it-self, and there's a source of ignition near by, an open flame could very likely ignite the gas," said Matthews. Firefighters aren't sure yet whether that is what happened because the caved-in roof and floors have temporarily blocked access to the site of the fire's ori-

Jason Potter alerted his guests and all 20 were able to get out of the house safely, Matthews said.

Damage to the one-story ranch was estimated at \$100,000. The figure includes \$30,000 in contents. The family was insured.

The wind direction and the proximity of a neighboring house placed it in danger for a while. But firefighters succeeded in controlling the blaze before it received any damage, Matthews said.

Many voices heard in '88

Voters said no to higher taxes for schools, and Citizens for Better Education said ditto to R-rated movies. St. John's Seminary and Farmer Jack both said goodbye to the Plymouth area, and the Jaycees and Rotarians said hello to women.

The events that shaped life in the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township during 1988 have either been filed away forever or relegated to the "old business" section of public meeting agendas.

Some of the stories that surfaced last year were in the spotlight only briefly. Others reared their heads in January and came back up for air a number of times in the following

Citizens for Better Education, which identifies itself as a "Christian" group, began the year by telling officials of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools members didn't like some of the things students are seeing and hearing. Members objected to an animated filmstrip called "Winnie the Witch," saying it is con-

trary to Bible teachings. "I'm begging you to stop this nonsense." Diane Daskalakis, who founded the group, told the board of

education at a January meeting. cized the content of certain school programs. This time, they said some promoted homosexuality, abortion, witchcraft and Satanism.

School officials had to face more pressing issues last year; namely, making \$4.4 million in cuts after voters refused to support an 11-year, 2mill tax (during a March special election) and a Headlee Amendment

override on the June ballot.

After the March defeat, school officials talked about cuts. They warned there would be fewer teachers, larger class sizes, participation, fees for sports and other extracurricular activities, as well as a moratorium on the purchase of new text-

"I still say it's a basic dissatisfaction with the tax structure," Superintendent John M. Hoben said after the June election. "I don't take it as a reflection on me. I think people are fed up with taxes."

The schools were forced to scale down the attendance monitoring program at Centennial Educational Park and officials predicted an increase in absenteeism. Sure enough, December brought word that unexcused absences were on the rise.

"That particular cut affected every single student at the high schools," said Rita Ringer, the attendance supervisor, citing a rise in vandalism and fights on the campus.

AND THE Plymouthrock Saloon was in limbo at the beginning of 1988 and that's exactly where it ended the year. The beleaguered bar hit the news for the first time this year when Plymouth Township officials announced they would hold a public hearing to determine whether the bar had violated the local liquor or-

The saloon has been through a lot during 1988: The township claimed the establishment was serving alcohol to minors and deemed it a nuisance. Local officials recommended that the state revoke its license. The Michigan Liquor Control Commission did just that, but the bar got an injunction to stop the state from stopping the liquor from flowing.

The saloon's license was put up for sale in October. Later that month the state said unless the license is transferred to a new owner, it would be revoked on May 1, 1989. The revocation was appealed, and the May deadline was set aside pending the outcome of a February hearing.

IN JUNE, Catholic church dignitaries from throughout the state arhealth books and R-rated movies rived in Plymouth Township to attend Mass one more time at St. John's Provincial Seminary. Declining enrollment prompted Archdiocese of Detroit officials to close the 40-year-old institution after the last class graduated in May. The 175-acre complex is still on the sell-

At 30 years, the Farmer Jack store on South Main Street was not quite as old as the seminary. But the corporate powers-that-be decided to close the doors, abruptly and permanently, on Dec. 3.

"It's sad. Something about a store, it becomes part of people's lives," said Gilbert Borman, a company spokesman.

The Plymouth Kiwanis and Rotary clubs both inducted female members in 1988, and the Jaycees elected a woman as their president. The formerly all-male bastions opened their doors to the other half of the population after the U.S. Supreme Court ruled they had to. New members took the change in stride.

"It's a service club. I don't see it as a men's club or a women's club," said Nancy Petrucelli, a real estate saleswoman who joined the Kiwanis.

THE WARM weather and the close of schools for summer vacation brought swarms of teenagers to the streets of Plymouth once again in 1988. The "cruisers" got tickets in record numbers last year. But city officials expressed relief that alcohol-related violations among cruisers decreased near the end of the summer.

"I think continuing with the high visibility of police officers had the needed effect," Paul Sincock, assistant to the city manager, said at the

It's a good thing they don't lock up cruisers - local prisons had trouble finding room for those who committed more serious crimes. The overcrowding issue surfaced April 25, when Northville Township sued the state Department of Corrections.


Local officials got an injunction to prohibit further admissions at the Scott and Phoenix facilities in Northville and the Western Wayne facility in Plymouth. By the June 5 deadline, the number of inmates at each prison was back down to the allowable limit.

THE TOWNSHIPS of Northville, Plymouth and Canton banded together to help solve the problem of where to send solid waste. All three townships approved a plan to stop sending sewage to Detroit and reroute it to the Ypsilanti Community Utility Authority plant. The townships will have to come up with between \$67 million and \$73 million to build sewer lines to the YCUA plant.

Though local municipalities got things accomplished, they weren't immune from crime. There was a murder in Plymouth Township and a fatal cocaine overdose in the Plymouth city jail.

The body of a 23-year-old town-ship man, Kevin Kinney, was found in late October, and 22-year-old Patrick Dennis, also of the township, was charged with first degree murder in the case.

The overdose occurred in February, after city police arrested Matthew Anderson, a 23-year-old Detroit man, on a narcotics charge. Anderson had cocaine on his body at the time of his arrest and was not

Pawnbrokers tune in to memories, stories

Early in the morning, Jeffrey Harrison may hear the sounds of guitars, mariachi serenades, tambourines,

gospel and hootenanny music, a vio-lin symphony or a sad story. No, Harrison, 36, of Southfield isn't in the music business. He is the owner of Bim's Jewelry and Loan on Livernois and Fort Street in southwest Detroit. Harrison's father, Ben, 76, started the business in 1943 on chigan and Third.

Harrison's partner in the business is William Geden of Troy, a certified mologist. The two have been friends since school days.

"I wasn't much of a student." Harrison said. "I grew up in this business. It's easy to learn and step into. It's a different kind of education."

Church people and musicians who come in to buy instruments or public address systems are among those who often provide the unsolicited early-morning entertainment for the partners. A harp, according to Harrison, is one of the most unusual items pawned in his store.

Gone from the front of the shop is the traditional three-ball, "German coat of arms" symbolizing banking. The business has gone through many other changes.

"I'VE BEEN a pawnbroker for 18

years," Harrison said. "That may carry a stigma, but why run and hide from it? We're a poor man's bank where people can get a loan for as little as \$5, \$50 or \$100.

"The old, traditional pawn shop business makes us look like angels. They'd take merchandise for 30 days at excessive rates and sell unclaimed merchandise to dealers. Bim's is more of a retail jewelry store with new and out-of-loan items. We give six-month loans at 3percent interest."

Some 85 percent of the customers redeem their merchandise, Harrison said. Unredeemed jewelry can be redesigned or remounted and sold at prices as low as 50 percent of retail.

Loan transactions are all on comput-

Harrison once sold a \$30,000 diamond and emerald necklace and earrings set. Another big sale was a 3.64-carat diamond ring. Steady customers with "wish lists" come from as far away as Ypsilanti and Saline to buy jewelry.

"WE GO by demand," Harrison said. "Our best loan is on guns. Whenever we take an item, we get fingerprints and descriptions of the customer for the police. We buy and sell or loan money on anything of value that's up-to-date.





Despite publication of the largest, most comprehensive nursing home guide in history, health care professionals still say the best way to choose a facility is by personal in-

Release of a state-by-state nursing home guide last month, with homes rated for 32 areas of service, gave consumers the ability to shop at home for long-term care facilities for themselves or loved ones.

But health care professionals say the Federal Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) report can be as confusing as it is enlightening.

On the plus side, the report provides a wealth of information about individual homes. Items such as total number of residents, number of wheelchair-bound residents and number of confused or disoriented residents are provided at consumer fingertips.

The area's 15 nursing homes were among those evaluated. (For more information on western Wayne homes, see the accompanying arti-

Health professionals, however, say cold hard facts alone aren't enough.

"THERE'S SO many other intangibles that can make it the right or wrong place for a given person," Cheryl Robinson of the Health Care Association of Michigan said. "It's not all just facts."

Even facts can be misleading, professionals said. While homes are also evaluated on items ranging from cleanliness to the amount of privacy given each resident, grading is on a

pass/fail scale. Type and degree of abuses are unrecorded. Nor is there any follow-up on whether problems were corrected.

Raw numbers could also be misleading, professionals said.

"We provide a lot of in-service
staff training on how to care for Alzheimer's patients," Westland Convalescent Center spokesperson Sally
Levay said. "Yet, you won't see that
reflected in the recort. What you will reflected in the report. What you will see is that we have confused or disoriented residents."

Another problem: some of the material is up to 18 months old.

"It's not current and it doesn't tell the public enough," said Lillian Schuyler, director of the Middlebelt Nursing Center, Livonia,

Even the HCFA itself said the report was a "snapshot" of conditions at particular nursing homes on the day surveyed — a guide to be used when visiting homes rather than as a substitute for visits.

The information does not describe the the home's success or failure in taking prompt corrective ac-tion to remedy problems. Similarly, there is no guarantee that those items in compliance with federal requirements at the time of the survey remained in compliance," HCFA administrator Dr. William Roper wrote in the report's preface.

ALMOST ALL nursing homes arrange tours for prospective clients. Many also allow visitors to drop in for less formal walk-throughs.

Citizens for Better Care, a national agency advocating improvements in nursing home care, lists these criteria for selecting a home:

For types of problems found at area nursing homes, see page 11A.

The group suggests questioning management about areas kept off limits.

· Observe how staff treats residents. Citizens for Better Care suggests potential clients pay careful attention to how much respect and privacy patients receive.

• Ask what services the home provides. Whether the home has a resident council, where patients can air grievances, could be a determining factor in whether it should be selected.

· Ask about nursing staff's orientation, training. The group recom-mends asking when and where staff members were trained and how much training they received.

· Ask about levels of care delivered at the home. Whether the home is equipped for basic care or the more specialized care known as

agree the process is difficult and of-ten emotionally wrenching, no matter how a home is selected.

Professionals suggest home selec-tion should be undertaken even before it is necessary.

"What's best is for people to begin looking around while they or their loved ones can still make those decisions themselves," Levay said. "Obviously, there's a tremendous amount of guilt involved. But people need to know they're doing what's best for their loved ones."

with three or more violations recorded against them in the guidebook say their homes evaluations are

no longer valid. Problems, they said, have been corrected.

A combined 31 violations were found at the area's 15 nursing home facilities by federal Health Care Financing Administration inspectors.

Canton Care Center was judged in violation in eight of the 32 areas presented for public review in the HCFA report, "Medicare/Medicaid Nursing Home Information.

Administrator Beverly Sciberras said home conditions were "100 percent improved," since the home's May 1987 evaluation.

The Canton Township-based home was also taken off the state of Michigan decertification list.

'We have lifted litigation because of improved performance," said Michigan Department of Public Health Licensing officer Dalphine

According to the HCFA report, Canton Care Center failed to assure each resident was free from mental and physical abuse, to provide nursing services at all times to meet the needs of residents, to provide daily personal hygiene for each resident and to provide necessary care for each resident with bowel or bladder problems.

In addition, the report cited the home for failing to provide rehabilitative nursing care for each resident, a written health care plan for each resident, clean toilet and bathroom facilities and sanitary common use

The home was found deficient in providing daily personal hygiene, skin care, necessary bed sore care and adequate bowel and bladder care for each resident as well as in administering drugs according to the written orders of the attending phy-

A spokeswoman for the home said she was unaware of any current problems.

Nightingale West Nursing Home, Westland and University Convalescent Nursing Home, Livonia were found to have three violations each.

"There's been another survey and it will show we've corrected all problems," Livenia Convalescent Home administrator Kay Kermode said. "I think the public has a right

to know, but you have to realize the

person doing the survey is in the home for a day or two at most; it's difficult to get a true picture. We're always open for people to see for themselves." The facility was evaluated in February 1988.

Problems at Nightingale have also been corrected, according to administrator Norman Burger.

'Everything has been corrected," he said. "We're glad to have the inspections but often the inspectors aren't uniform in making their evaluations. You could pass for 18 years and another inspector could come in and see something differently." The facility was evaluated in October

Congress wrestles over deficit, raise

By Wayne Peal

Seasonal spirit and politically pleasing cabinet picks by Presidentelect George Bush made for a happy holiday season in Washington.

But area congressmen warn a grinch, the massive federal deficit, could put an end to the festivities shortly after the new administration takes office.

"Everything revolves around the deficit," Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, said. "Everybody is waiting to see who'll be first to come forth with the hard, bitter pills needed to eliminate the deficit." Ford's district includes southern Livonia, Westland, Garden City and Canton Township.

Rep. Sander Levin, D-Southfield, agreed the deficit was the nation's biggest issue at the start of the Bush

"I THINK he (Bush) has to look at his campaign promises," Levin said. "On one hand, he wants more programs but on the other he's not coming up with a way to pay for them. He's going to have to be an acrobat on a tightrope to pull it off." Levin's district includes Redford Township.

Congress and the new chief executive should expect to quickly get down to work, Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, said.

"The issues facing the 101st Congress most likely will mean a very short honeymoon for President Bush and that's assuming there's going to be a honeymoon," said Pursell, whose district includes northern Livonia, Plymouth and Plymouth Township.
While Democrats are complaining

about the budget deficit, they've been fairly pleased by Bush's cabinet appointees.

"THUS FAR, we're not complain-ing about the kind of people he's been picking," Ford said. "It's a lot different from Reagan. Reagan picked his cronies and, in a lot of cases, you had people at odds with the departments they were supposed to be heading."

Pursell criticized his colleagues for favoring a pay increase, saying it sends the wrong message at a time when the government may have to seek cutbacks in other areas to balance the budget.

Ford, however, said the congressional pay increase would have almost no effect on the deficit.

"You're talking about 535 people out of 3 million federal employees," Ford said. The increase would also benefit

federal judges. Levin said the increase, while necessary, could be pared.

"There's a need, but maybe not for an increase as large as proposed," he

State Senate fails to act on day care

Those who perform day care services at home will have to wait until sometime later this year for state

protection from zoning ordinances.

Faxon sponsored three bills to rescue such women from a "Catch-22" situation: if they registered their day

care operations with the state, they found themselves running afoul of local zoning ordinances. His Senate Bills 687-689 would


have prohibited local units from zon-ing them out. State law takes precedence over local ordinances. The latter two bills, 688-689, affecting townships and counties, were passed and will become law.

BUT THE House amended Faxon's SB 687, governing cities, and re-turned it to the Senate for concur-

rence in the amendments. The Senate vote came during its 21-hour session of Dec. 7-8, and SB 687 was a vote short.

"The votes were there," Faxon said. "But somebody was off the



Polly went home, just two days after going through surgery for kidney stones. The 5-year-old English bulldog is recovering nicely.

Kidney stones are very rare in dogs, said Dr. Eric Heitman of the Pearce Veterinary Hospital in Southfield, where Polly stayed after undergoing a procedure called lithotripsy at the Ohio Kidney Stone Center in Columbus late last month.

Lithotripsy is performed on humans to fragment the stones so the particles can pass through the urine. Polly is the first dog to have the procedure, though it has been performed on laboratory animals. In fact she is the first pet with kidney stones Dr. Richard Pearce has seen in his 35 years of veterinary prac-

Polly's owners, George Cramer and Julie Garcia of Southfield, brought Polly to the veterinary hospital this summer because the dog was getting urinary infections and had blood in her urine, Heitman said.

"ANTIBIOTICS weren't helping the chronic condition," Heitman said. "So we ran a series of tests and X-rays and the diagnosis was kidney stones. The two modes of therapy are diet modification or surgery to dissolve the stones.

Four hospitals in Michigan use the ultrasound machine, which costs about \$1.5 million, Heitman said. He talked to urologists in each hospital, and they were excited about the prospect of taking care of Polly. But hospital administrators wouldn't ad-

mit the four-legged patient. Heitman called several other sources and was finally referred to the Ohio Kidney Stone Center, which has a lithotripsy unit owned by urologists and surgeons.

The center not only agreed to use the procedure on Polly but donated time and services, Heitman said.

"I went to the center with Polly and her owners so I could administer the anesthetic," Heitman said. "I brought our own anesthetics and monitoring equipment along.

The procedure took 45 minutes. Polly was strapped to a chair and immersed in water because ultrasound waves don't travel in the air. Water transmits the beams, which hit the kidney stones.'

Veterinarians at Pearce are taking particles from Polly's urine and analyzing them to determine how to prevent the stones from coming

Driver sought in dog's hit-and-run death

While most people were preparing to welcome a new year Saturday, Ray Cogo was saying goodbye to a

The friend, Bella, a seven-monthold timber shepherd, was struck and killed by a hit-and-run driver on New Year's Eye. The accident took place at 5 p.m. on Middlebelt Road just south of Six Mile in Livonia.

Numerous people saw the accident; some people even stopped to help. Cogo is hoping that witnesses will contact him so that he can turn information about the accident over to Livonia police.

The Livonia resident is also offering a \$500 reward for information about the car that hit Bella, a dog specially bred in South Carolina for both tracking and protection. Cogo can be contacted at 427-6292.

It's a misdemeanor to hit a dog

and drive off, said Livonia Police Of-ficer Orville Kappen. The penalty is ber of the hit-and-run car, Smith ficer Orville Kappen. The penalty is a \$500 fine and/or 90 days in jail.

BELLA WAS apparently tracking her master Saturday when she crossed Middlebelt.

"I'm still in shock," said Cogo, who did not see the accident. The car that hit Cogo kept going.

Four other cars, however, didn't. Mary Smith, who works at Albie's Pasties on Middlebelt, close to where Bella was hit, said she was

surprised at the compassion of the four drivers who did stop. "I've seen dogs hit before, but very seldom do I see people stop," Smith said. "Three cars stopped

right in the road." The driver of one vehicle, a gray or olive-green van, may have seen the car that hit the dog, Smith said.

ANOTHER woman in a white car wrote down license numbers and

also stopped.

Together, Cogo and this driver wrapped Bella in a blanket and took her to a veterinarian in Dearborn Heights, where she died.

Bella was special for two reasons, Cogo said. She was their first dog and filled "a special spot" for the Cogos, who've been married five years but have no children.

She also was a special breed of dog — a timber shepherd, part wolf and part shepherd, trained to track lost people or provide protection. Cogo got Bella from South Caroli-na-based LRRP Security Services

Inc., where the breed was first developed. Cogo said he paid \$1,100 for

"THEY'RE 371/2 percent timber wolf, and 621/2 percent European shepherd dog," said Kristi Hammer, administrative assistant for the security service. "He (the breeder) wanted to come up with a dog that

wanted to come up with a log that would be a good pet, and a good protector" for both people and property. Some Timber shepherds are trained for police departments; some are used as seeing eye dogs.

Kosteva's recycling bills are law

Two bills sponsored by state Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton, are part of an eight-bill package promoting recycling that Gov. James J. Blanchard has signed into law. The new laws and an executive or-

der will make state government a leader in the effort to reduce the nearly 12 million tons of trash generated in Michigan every year, the governor said.

Kosteva's House Bills 5805-5806 and a companion measure require the labeling of plastic containers to facilitate plastics recycling.

They establish a government-in-dustry plastics recycling consortium to do research on recycling technolo-

And they create a recycling target enterprise advisory committee within the state Department of Natural Resources to promote creation of jobs in the recycling industry.

Winter blues: hibernation for humans?

Some people call it the winter doldrums, but researchers who studied the behavior have termed the desire to slow down and burrow for the winter the hibernation response.

Furry creatures in the wild head for shelter to sleep out the winter, and the authors of a new book called "The Hibernation Response" said people feel the same need.

Everyone thought that human beings might be different, that we're immune to all that," said Dr. Peter Whybrow, chairman of psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine.

But, he pointed out, "we are ani-

In their book, Whybrow and co-author Robert Bahr included explanations of "Why You Feel Fat, Miserable and Depressed from October through March" and offered tips on how to survive another nasty winter.

Whybrow said nearly everyone is affected to some degree by the changing of the seasons. With the coming of winter, physical and psy-chological changes are triggered by the diminishing light and colder temperatures.

Donald Brown, director of counseling at the University of Michigan-Dearborn, agreed with that analysis.

"I think it's even more complex than that," Brown said. "There have been studies on the effect of sunlight that show people are more depressed in areas like Michigan, that don't get much sunlight in winter."

Brown agreed there are seasonal changes in behavior.

"It's easy to feel good when it's spring and the flowers are blooming," he said.

For some people, the changes brought on by the dark days of win-ter are profound, marked by depression, sadness, fatigue, social withdrawal, a craving for carbohydrates and lack of interest in sex.

Doctors have pegged that condi-

tion as a "seasonal affective disorder," or SAD.

In a 15-month study that began in 1983, Whybrow looked at the influence of the seasons on behavior. He had 100 people keep detailed daily records of their sleep, energy, appetite and mood.

'We discovered that just about everyone slept more in the winter, they all ate more, gained weight, they became more irritable and had less energy" — all classic symptoms of the hibernation responses, Whybrow



Inheritance tax is '89 priority for lawmakers

State Senate Republicans vow cutting the inheritance tax will be a 1989 priority - whether the Blanchard administration likes it or not.

"We have a good-commitment from the House leadership to give this fair consideration next year," said Sen. Nick Smith, R-Hillsdale, as the Michigan Legislature met for two hours before adjourning for the

year.
"The inheritance tax jeopardizes the middle-income group," said Smith, author of a Senate-passed bill (SB 1) to cut that tax virtually to zero and halt the drain of retirees to Florida. He noted many Democratic legislators support that reform, even if their leaders wouldn't let it come

Blanchard's top economic spokesman, state treasurer Robert Bowman, said in the lobby afterwards. The inheritance tax should have a review. But I'm not convinced it has to be changed."

BOTH HOUSES Thursday gave near-unanimous approval to a tax bill (SB 279) after removing a Republican provision tying it to Smith's

As passed and sent to the governor, the tax bill will:

The total cost of health care is related to two factors, the unit price for each medical service multiplied by the number of times the service is provided, according to Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Michigan. Officials said total costs will continue to increase as the number of claims for benefits increases. Although Blue

Cross/Blue Shield enrollment has dropped from 5 million in 1980 to 4.7 million in 1987, the number of claims filed has increased. The dollar amount for benefits paid by Blue Cross and . Blue Shield in 1987 was \$4.2 billion, almost double the \$2.3 billion in benefits paid in 1980.

Employers struggling with health care costs

If Joe Dokes, a typical K mart employee, goes to the hospital for an appendectomy next week, he will suffer twice. First from appendicitis, second from bad timing.

If Dokes had surgery before Jan. 1, he would have had to pay very little, if any, of the doctors' fees, hospital expenses or related costs. His health care insurance would have paid most necessary and customary proce-

But after Dec. 31, Dokes has to pay a \$200 deductible plus 20 percent of the remaining expenses.

what one executive termed the "Cadillac" of health care coverage to the "Pontiac." The changes were analyzed and provided employees with the option of traditional pay-for-service coverage or membership in a health maintenance organization, or HMO. But with either op-

tion, Dokes is now obligated for a deductible and co-pay.

"We still provide excellent benefits for employees and their dependents," said Donald L. Morford, K mart assistant director of benefits. "But we could no longer provide first dollar coverage."

He said the high cost of providing health care benefits forced the corporation to take a hard look at its insur-

ance program and to make adjustments.

K mart isn't alone. Faced with the prospect of premiums doubling over the next five years, companies are being forced to look for ways to provide good health insurance coverage while containing costs.

THE WORD "containing" is significant because employers no longer talk about cutting or maintaining costs. Health care expenses increase so rapidly, most would be happy to, as one company executive put it, "get our arms around costs."

Switching to some kind of deductible — along with a co-pay for remaining costs - is the most common way companies try to contain costs. And probably the most

effective, according to most analysts. The Big Three automakers — Michigan's standard-setters for benefits and compensation — switched to a

deductible and co-pay years ago. Even so, their expenses have increased dramatically.

The General Motors Corp., Ford Motor Co. and

Chrysler Corp. reported paying nearly \$5 billion for employee health care in 1988. And costs are rising nearly three or four times the normal rate of inflation. 'We expect costs to increase between 13 and 20 per-

cent per year," said Jack K. Shelton, manager of employee insurance at Ford. "That means existing costs (already staggering) could double within six years." While this seems bothersome for workers at the auto companies, it is more ominous for those with less bountiful coverage. Trends are bothersome for employees with "Pontiac" health care benefits. But they are more

worrisome for those with "Model T" coverage SPIRALING HEALTH care costs are even worse for the estimated 37 million Americans who have no health care benefits, either because they are unemployed or work at jobs that don't provide health care benefits. Reasons for the increase in health care costs are as

complicated as they are nebulous. Some experts blame overutilization; that is, employees seem to be using health benefits more frequently.

Sometimes physicians are involved in the overuse, ordering what some believe are unnecessary tests and discounted they are unnecessary tests are unnecessary tests and discounted they are unnecessary tests are unneces

agnostic procedures because they are unsure of their own capacities or feel obligated to protect themselves

own capacities or feel obligated to protect themselves against malpractice litigation.

But good doctors don't do that, according to Laurence M. Gelman, principal with Mercer Meidinger Hansen, a Detroit management consulting firm. "Doctors who know what they are doing and have confidence in their own ability don't order needless tests," he said. "And they don't need extra procedures because they are afraid somebody will sue them."

The United States had 40 percent more doctors in 1988 than in 1975, according John Marakas, chairman of the Health Insurance Association of America (HIAA), "all of whom need to make a living one way or another.

"In most areas and in most specialties physicians are able to increase both the demand for their services by encouraging return visits and their income by raising their fees," Marakas said in a speech on cost containment delivered Oct. 31.

'Since physician earnings account for about 20 percent of total health care costs and are responsible for about 70 percent of total health care outlays, close scrutiny is in order," Marakas said.

ONE STATISTIC the HIAA said seems suspicious is that U.S. women undergo three times as many hysterectomies as women in other parts of the world.

Many cancer patients will elect to undergo chemotherapy - despite debilitating side effects - even though the treatment is rarely successful.

But it's wrong to point to any single factor as the major cause of skyrocketing health care costs, said Jack Shelton, manager of employee insurance at Ford. "So many factors enter into it."

Society may, in fact, be the victim of its own success by prolonging life and life expectancy, he said. Illnesses or complications that were usually fatal years ago are now considered treatable, if not preventable,

Polio is an example, but by no means the most dra-matic. A health scourge in the 1950s, polio has been virtually wiped out by a vaccine.

"We are living longer and demanding more medical attention," Shelton noted. "It's a very complicated and perplexing problem."

While experts have varying opinions about the cause of increasing health care, there seems to be a growing consensus about what companies will be forced to do as

More and more companies, like K mart, are switching to "Pontiac" coverage with the deductible and co-

payments. If the company is employee-conscientious, however, the deductible and co-paywill be reasonable.

The new K mart coverage, for example, requires a \$200 deductible with the employee also paying 20 percent of expenses thereafter. Some experts say deductibles and co-pays could range much higher as companies that the enduce their expenses.

try to reduce their expenses.
"There is a direct relationship between the amount of the deductible and use of benefits," said Franklin J. Ellias, health care benefits consultant. "People think twice about going to the doctor when they have to pay part of the cost."

THE OPPOSITE occurs when the employer simply increases the workers' share of the premium, Ellias said. "When the employer increases the amount of money somebody must pay, the general reaction is to use the benefits more often to make sure they get their money's

Perhaps more significant than deductibles and co-pays are the new buzzwords, "medical case manage-ment," according to Ellias and other experts who say that will be the health care trend of the 1990s.

In its simplest form, medical case management boils down to the patient getting approval before surgery, before going into the hospital or even before undergoing certain diagnostic tests, explained Gelman of consult-ants Mercer Meidinger Hansen,

"It's generally between the physician and the health care provider," he said. "But it means the doctor must check with the insurance company before he obligates the patient. The doctor must pre-certify that the surgery or the hospitalization is necessary."

Contractors, unions sign pact

Evaluating anything by its goals is

But in the absence of a track record or anything more concrete, goals are perhaps the most convenient way of trying to assess the pact signed last month between unionized contractors in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties and the building

Supporters, like Michael R. Haller, senior vice president of the Walbridge Aldinger Co. of Livonia, use terms like "historic" to describe the pact that was formalized Dec. 12 during ceremonies at the Detroit Chapter of the Associated General Contractors.

The agreement will "help area contractors be more competitive," said Raymond T. Glowski, secretarytreasurer of the Greater Detroit Building Trades Council.

The pact is known by the acronym MUST, or Management and Union Serving Together and was negotiated between the Associated General Contractors, with hundreds of member companies, and the Detroit Building Trades representing more

than 30,000 tradesmen.

Haller and Glowski are co-chairmen on the MUST executive committee and said the agreement has enormous importance and potential.

"We didn't go into this lightly," said Haller. Both parties discussed the need for a cooperative agree-ment for months before it was signed. Each side contributed \$70,000 for expenses like hiring an executive director for MUST and related administrative costs.

"That's commitment," Haller

MUST'S MISSION, according to Haller and Glowski, is to maintain or increase market share for unionized contractors. That, of course, is the traditional, bread-and-butter goal of labor-management agreements: "more business to provide more

Haller said that will entail some specific goals such as: 1) Dispelling some myths about unionized con-

tractors, 2) communicating with the users of construction services - the developers, companies or public entities that build shopping centers, libraries, etc. — and 3) joining in the effort to attract or expand business in metropolitan Detroit

I can see two MUST members (one union and one management) going to another state or area of the country to help economic develop-ment agencies attract business to this area," said Haller.

None of those goals can be accom-plished overnight, Haller acknowledged. "But they are important to the continued success of our indus-

One of the biggest problems is the general impression that southeast Michigan has a bad labor and business climate with overpriced union workers who frequently do shoddy

"That's simply not true," Haller said emphatically. "And we must communicate that to the general

public as well as the people looking

HALLER ACKNOWLEDGED that compared with their non-union counterparts, union workers are frequently paid higher wages and enjoy greater fringe benefits, expenses that are generally passed along in the form of higher prices by unionized contractors

"But they (union workers) earn them," said Haller, a civil engineer. "I've worked on projects around the country and seen workers from different areas. I know that union workers here are skilled and produc-

Cost and productivity are more than hours on the job, he said. Efficiency also involves the number of units produced within a time frame and the quality of those units.

Such pre-certification has a "sentinel effect," said Ellias. Pre-certification makes the physician aware that a knowledgeable party is overseeing the process and is not likely to allow payment for unnecessary pro-

But medical case management is more than getting prior approval,

Ellias said. "In many cases, case management provides an advocate for the patient, somebody who will challenge the doctor, if necessary."

With case management, for exam-ple, the company health care benefits may require - and pay for the services of a visiting nurse rather than allowing longer stays in the hospital where average costs are approaching \$700 per day.

There are many specifics to case management, said Ellias. But they boil down to having an objective party looking for ways to contain costs without sacrificing patient care.

WHILE SOME companies are looking for ways to cut costs, others hope to save money by encouraging healthy living.

Those are the so-called "wellness"

plans under which employees are en-couraged to quit smoking, lose weight, reduce stress or otherwise modify behavior so they lead healthier lifestyles, said Gelman.

"If a company can encourage employees to quit smoking," he said, they can save enormous medical bills later on."

While people point to the possibili-ty of AIDS causing financial difficul-

ty for a health care system (the "average" AIDS case costs about \$150,000, according to some experts), there are other preventable problems that can be equally expensive, Gelman said.

The cost of treating a premature baby, for example — or one born with birth defects — can be very high, Gelman said. "Some wellness plans recognize that possibility by

encouraging good prenatal care among pregnant women," he said.

Such programs are worth well more than their costs if they persuade expectant mothers to curtail drug or alcohol consumption during pregnancy, Gelman said. "Not only does that give their baby a better shot at a healthier life, such programs reduce the need for very expensive medical care," he said.





"You can spend your whole life waiting for the right opportunity to come around," said Anagnos, who is dressed in a suit and staying in condition eating a salad. "I am writing my own vehicle for success. I have written a screenplay for myself which I am now in the process of marketing."

In the film "Tap," a famous tap dancer, the now 66-year-old Harold Nicholas, is featured doing the splits. Agnagos has become a personal friend of Nicholas' 74 year-old brother, Fayard, and it is for Fayard that Anagnos has written his first script, "Keep Dancing, Kid." A sec-ondary role was written for himself.

With the careful, anticipatory success scheme that seems to mark his life and personality, Anagnos has managed to place the script in the hands of no less than six director/ producers — Ted Lang ("Love Boat"), Debbie Allen ("Fame"), Jack Haley (Nicholas' son), Nick Castle ("Tap"), Telly Savalas, and Sylvester Stallone. At 22, Anagnos wanted to pursue a career and school in Los Angeles. His restaurant experience paid off for two years as a waiter for a Greek restaurant in L.A. The one hitch was that customers found out about his back flips off the wall and came in to see for themselves.

"This stunt may be my curse," Anagnos said. "I had to do that stunt sometimes three times a night for nearly two years."

Last year Anagnos got his first

commercial. In April, though, he quit-his restaurant life and became a fulltime dancer and actor. Now during the day he trains to keep himself in shape and works on his writing. He spends his evenings reading literature and biographies that will be useful in his new career.

"LAUREN BACALL once said, 'I owe my audience only one thing — a good performance,'" Anagnos said. "I don't believe that. I guess it was the way I was raised. I am in the hysiness of meeting people." business of meeting people."

Anagnos' big dream is to see himself in a film at the Showcase Cinema where he used to go when he was in high school. He has to return to Los Angeles before "Tap" is scheduled for release.

Perhaps while there he will catch his next film, "The Purple People Eater" with Ned Beatty and Shelley Winters. It is due to be released in April of 1989. He does a Fred Astaire dance routine.

Deposit law

Earmark funds for conservation

ICHIGAN RESIDENTS have been paying nickel and dime deposits on beverhottles and cans for 10 years nov The successful practice contributes to cleaner roadways and also provides a major message: Despite big money attempts to deceive and distort, the public is willing to put up with minor costs and inconvenience in order to protect the environment.

Think back to the campaign to put a deposit on Michigan cans and bottles. From the reaction of some union and manufacturing spokesmen, you would have thought that environmentalists had conspired to ruin the state's economy for all future generations.

Even though 400,000 voters in only six weeks signed a petition to put the question on the ballot, bottle bill opponents asked the courts to keep the issue away from voters.

When that failed, bottle bill opponents swung into overdrive with an expensive, distorted and misleading campaign. Opponents said the deposits would cost jobs, increase the cost of beverages and limit the variety of beverages available to Michigan consumers.

They also said such a deposit would make life miserable for Michigan consumers who would have to drag cans and bottles back to the store and, finally, they concluded that a bottle deposit would have little effect on roadside litter.

THE ARGUMENTS were patently ridiculous. But there was some concern that the onslaught of publicity churned out by a \$1.3 million campaign might carry the day. Supporters were spending only \$130,000.

Not to worry. Michigan voters, many of whom had grown up in an era when all cans and bottles had deposits, easily recognized the fraudulent nature of the opposition arguments.

Groups such as the Michigan United Conservation Clubs say unclaimed deposits should be earmarked for conservation and environmental protection projects. We agree, and we support the petition drive to this effect planned for this summer.

On Nov. 2, 1976, voters approved the deposit -2.1 million in favor to 1.2 million against. The law went into effect two years later.

Since then the Michigan Department of Transportation estimates that roadside litter has decreased by 41 percent, largely due to more than 90 percent drops of cans and bottles.

Problems caused by the random throwaway of these containers have virtually disappeared," said Al Almy, director of public affairs for the Michigan Farm Bureau.

Equally important is the fact that bottles and cans returned for deposits do not get thrown into trash bags destined for increasingly-rare landfill space. It is estimated that each year the deposit bill is responsible for removing 600,000 tons of bottle and can litter from Michigan's waste

"The Legislature shouldn't be so reluctant to ask Michigan citizens to do their part in addressing environmental problems," added Alex Sagady, former executive director of the Michigan Student Environmental Coalition.

That's a lesson that lawmaker's seem loathe to hear. It took another petition drive to browbeat Lansing lawmakers into requiring deposits for containers for wine coolers and so-called cocktails in a can. That goes into effect June 1 of this

Next on the agenda is an apparently sizable amount of money representing cans and bottles that consumers never return for the deposit. The figure is estimated to be as high as \$48 million, although bottling spokespeople say the amount is considerably less.
Groups such as the Michigan United Conserva-

tion Clubs say these unclaimed deposits should be earmarked for conservation and environmental protection projects. We couldn't agree more. And we support the petition drive to this effect planned for this summer.

The environment, a big issue of the '60s, has taken a back seat for too long. Belatedly, our beleaguered ecology is coming to the attention of public policy makers. When gauging public interest, they should look first at the support for and effect of the deposit bill. It works and it was the right thing to do.

That's not needed in a home where kids know that their parents are open and willing to interact with

I expect my kids to think through and challenge what they learn at school. I also expect them to do that with what they learn in church, what they read in a book, what they see on TV and what they hear at home. My responsibility is not to censor everything before it gets to them, but to teach them a strong value system against which they can run all of

I am concerned that this paper is, letting a few women speak as if they were the voice of conservative Christianity. Furthermore, I am appalled at their method of attack.

That's exactly what happened. At 7,000 feet winds were whistling at 50 to 70 miles an hour, temperatures fell to near zero, and tire chains were mandatory for driving. But of course you're asking about that other financial possibility which I mentioned. It was given a big play in the Nevada press, and probably some back home, that the Securities and Exchange Commission has been petitioned for permission to sell \$23.3 million in Mustang Ranch public stock. It is proposed that 1.165 million common shares be sold for \$20 each, according to a 136-page prospectus.

QUOTING again from a Reno newspaper, "The Mustang is the na-tion's largest and most famous legal 'house of ill-fame,' as the local ordinance puts it."

Let me quote further, but briefly, and at random:

"Like any well-run company, it's business before pleasure at Mustang Ranch where prostitutes receive 'consideration' from customers be-

fore services are rendered, according to the prospectus. Translation: Money before sex.

"Fifty to 90 'independent contrac-tors' live at the two-building bordello 10 miles east of Reno, according to the SEC filing. The prostitutes rent a room at Mustang, usually for \$10 a day and the promise to share with management 50-50 what they earn from customers.

"Upon settlement (on a price), the prostitute takes the man's money or credit card, gives it to a cashier who accepts payment and records in a book what the customer's money is buying. . . 'logging in,' according to the SEC filing. The book is not public

"The prostitutes generally work three weeks in a row, then get one week off. The women have their comforts, too, like a fully equipped kitchen and services for hair-dre ing, manicures, pedicures, facials and other beauty treatments. The prospectus notes it's good for business to keep the women happy."

If the stock offering is allowed, it

would be the first time a bordello has become a publicly traded corporation. I guarantee that ownership of a share would be a sure-fire conversational stimulant back in Michigan.

The Mustang currently is owned by Joe and Sally Conforte who have been trying to sell, so I read, since 1985 when Joe was released from prison after serving 18 months on charges involving \$2 million in unpaid income taxes. He says he wants to retire because more than 30 years in the prostitution business is enough. I wonder if the girls think so,

Team planning good for middle school students

Q: Our child is in grade 7. On the front of the school it says middle school, yet when I look at my child's schedule it looks like a high school schedule, six periods, six different classes. How does one recognize a real middle school?

A: A classic middle school program is different than your child is experiencing. There are three or four criteria to determine if it is a middle school. The first criteria is usually a sixth, seventh, eighth grade configuration as opposed to a seventh, eighth and ninth grade configuration.

The "transition grade" from a K-5 elementary setting or the sixth grade would most likely have students in a two-hour block of time in

an interdisciplinary approach with math and science taught together and social studies and English taught in a team (two teachers) teaching situation. Another middle school criterion would be that six or seven teachers and possibly a counselor would be on a larger team and have a team planning period where they meet, discuss and plan the academic, meet, discuss and plan the academic, sent to Doc Doyle c/o the Observsocial and emotional needs of each student. This team planning period is Schoolcraft, Livonia 48150.

Anderson grew up in Plymouth and graduated from Plymouth Salem High School in 1973. She earned a bachelor's degree in French business language from Eastern Michigan University in 1977. That degree was intended for use in international commerce.

She's working close to home as assistant manager of Plymouth Glass Co. Anderson, 33, is president of the Detroit Glass Dealers Association (DGDA).

She worked briefly after college graduation as a travel agent and as a private employment counselor before starting at Plymouth Glass

HER RESPONSIBILITIES as assistant manager are varied. She's primarily in charge of quoting for customers, and figures up jobs so quotes can be given. She dispatches the staff in the shop and keeps an eye on the counter, helping out when necessary.

"Mainly what I do is keep things moving." Hers isn't just a desk job; Anderson works in the shop as needed. She used to install windshields, and still cuts glass for other jobs. Anderson recently worked in the shop for several months when a glazier left.

Plymouth Glass Co. handles mostly flat glass, such as tub and shower enclosures, storm doors and windows, and mirrors. They do

work for residential and commercial buildings, in addition to working on cars.

The office is on Main Street in Plymouth, just north of Ann Arbor Road, and has been there since the late 1950s. Arch Racine started the business; he and his wife were close business partners.

"She was his second in command in a group of shops that included Plymouth Glass." Anderson saw her as a career-oriented person who did a great deal to keep the business running smoothly.

IN THE LATE 1950s, Anderson's father went to work for Arch Racine and in 1960 was assigned a manager position at Plymouth

At that time, the staff consisted of her father, a part-time secretary and one glazier. The building was much smaller. These days, the business has nine full-time employees and occupies one-third of the

Anderson's work has kept her

"It has been a constant, continu-

ing, ongoing challenge."
Her brother and sister worked at Plymouth Glass Co.

'As soon as we were old enough to come into the business, each one of us was given the opportunity." Her brother works in sales at Walker & Buzenberg Furniture in Plymouth. Her sister now has a family.

Anderson's sister-in-law, Quinn Anderson, works at Plymouth Glass Co. as the bookkeeper. Glass companies typically are family businesses, Kim Anderson said.

"It's not terribly uncommon for women to be involved in the glass companies." Many women have served on the board for the Detroit Glass Dealers Association; it's been less common for women to have the time to serve as president and to handle their business responsibilities.

Anderson was recently re-elected to a one-year term as president of the DGDA. She's also been vice president and a board member, and isn't the first woman to serve as president; a woman from Wyandotte served as president in the

THE ASSOCIATION, founded in 1932, is involved in many projects. One project Anderson worked on was an auto glass training program, the first of its kind in the country. That program received state funding and provided job training and placement.

Association leaders are working on an advertising program. A membership drive is keeping Anderson busy; monthly meetings and educational seminars require time and effort.

"I'm definitely a working presi-

The DGDA provides educational services and helps independent retailers maintain that competitive edge. Association members are working on "Glass Expo," a major trade show to be held in September in Dearborn.

The association works to maintain high safety standards as well; the newsletter is sent to dealers who don't belong to the DGDA, helping them keep up with safety

Anderson intends to continue her work with the Detroit Glass Dealers Association, and considers working with the national trade association as well. Arch Racine, from Plymouth Glass, was active in the national and Detroit associations; members of the Detroit group were instrumental in establishing the national association in the late 1940s.

SHE PLANS to continue working at Plymouth Glass Co. It keeps her busy, but Anderson finds time for other activities.

"I grew up around horses. I still enjoy horses, but I don't ride all that much." Her sister has horses and Anderson occasionally rides when she's visiting there.

Anderson's primary hobby has been extensive renovation of her Romulus home. She enjoys being with her four nephews, who range in age from not quite 2 to 7.

"They are just the greatest. And I'm totally objective about this, of

She has served on the board and is a member of the Michigan Women's Studies Association. Anderson's done graduate work in gui-dance and counseling at EMU. She worked for about five years as a volunteer peer counselor at the Women's Resource Center at Schoolcraft College, and enjoyed that experience.

Her fiance's support has been a tremendous help to Anderson.

"I appreciate and respect his opinion." Her father's also been a help to her.

Between the two of them, they keep me out of trouble."

And the number is growing. Haven't heard of the Bahai Faith? Chances are you're not alone. Members say the group doesn't proselytize or solicit money from outside sources. They meet regularly in member's homes

The premise of the Bahai Faith is simple. They believe that their faith is the most recent stage in the evolution of one Divinely ordained process, including Hinduism, Buddhism, Judaism, Christianity, Islam along with others.

Like Allah, Buddha, Christ and Mohammad are to their respective followers, Bahaullah is considered the divine messenger of the Bahai

"So we have much in common with a lot of religions," said Barbara LaFerier, chairwoman of the Canton Bahai Faith group. "What is new about us is that we believe that Bahaullah has given us some new laws to live by in this age."

SOME BASIC priniciples of the Bahai Faith include:

- Independent search for truth. · Elimination of all forms of prejudice.
- Universal auxiliary language. Equality of men and women.

• Agreement between science and religion.

• Elimination of extremes of wealth and poverty.

 Universal peace upheld by a world government.

Obviously, those are easier said than done. But in the process of striving for oneness with mankind, Bahais learn a great deal about religion and other culturesof the world.

'We're in the spiritual business of breaking down barriers between people," said Mary Olson, public relations chairwoman of the Canton Bahai group. "We're interested in bringing cultures together for better understanding of one another."

The Canton group is diverse and includes a woman from Iran. The Bahai Faith has a strong following in that country, despite reported per-secution for their beliefs.

In Canton, the group has been around for 15 years. Members meet every 19 days for the 19 Day Feast. Except they don't bring forks. The feast is not of the food variety but of a spiritual one. Matters of devotional, social and administrative are dealt with as is the reading of spiritual materials. The Bahaullah had written more than 250 books, some have yet to be translated.

"WE ENJOY reading those along with the Bible, the Koran and all the writings of great religions," Olson said. "They all have one source -

The group also is involved with a youth group for the greater Detroit area and sponsors a Bahai chapter at Eastern Michigan University.

The Bahai's also have public meetings at various places in Canton. Usually, discussions center on issues of world peace or the elimination of prejudice racial, religious and otherwise. They're issues with difficult

Unanswered questions, though, are what have led many people to the Bahai Faith. Olson was raised as a Catholic but remembers being intrigued by Buddhism, figuring all those people "couldn't be wrong." Bob Smith, vice-chairman of the Canton Bahai's, echos similar rea-sons for joining the group in 1976. Raised a Christian, Smith had con-verted to Judism and then found the

"The principle thing that attracted me was the acceptance of other re-ligious as valid," said Smith, who belongs to the Bahai Faith along with his wife Gloria. "I thought, 'Here's someone who doesn't condemn other religions' . . . People didn't have to say, 'Gee, I was wrong.'"

The Baihi Faith has its roots tied to Persia. On May 23, 1844, a young man known as The Bab is said to have announced the coming of a messenger from God.

FOR HIS announcement, the Bab was arrested, beaten and executed. Some 20,000 of his people were killed in massacres that followed in

Bahaullah, a member of one of the great patrician families of Persia, later announced himself as the messenger promised by Bab. He, too, was imprisoned and tortured. He died in 1892.

Bahaullah addressed a series of letters to the rulers, proclaiming the coming unification of humanity and the emergence of world civilization.

Followers strive to make that message come true today. Except, they try to do it in a low-key manner. Preaching of any type is not allowed. The faith is also self-supporting, and refuses contributions from outside sources.

"We do not proselytize," Olson said. "We believe in the independent search for truth. If you believe in that premise, you're not likely to try and get people to join your religion through any means."

A nursing home visit gives a warm feeling

Nursing/convalescent home visits have been a regular part of my life for more than three decades. During college and seminary years, the visits were more group activities, with singing, games, general conversation and worship.

My visits as a parish pastor have been with specific members and friends of the parish. Holiday visits in past years with uncles and aunts, family friends, et al, have added another dimension to my experiences with nursing/convalescent homes.

Three weeks ago, my wife's father was transferred from the hospital to a nursing/convalescent home. The art of medical diagnosis had failed to identify the causes of his deteriorating condition, and the hospital would no longer care for him. In less than four weeks, Grandpa V. had changed from a healthy and very active 88-year-old to a man unable to care for himself.

Nursing/convalescent homes come in all different sizes and shapes. Grandpa V's home is one level and less than three years old. Owned and operated by a religious institution, it presents the kind of care facility we consider representative of our regard and esteem for life.

MOST OF my nursing/convales-cent home visits have been relative-ly brief. Seldom have they been more than an hour, and more fre-quently they are a half-hour or less. Rarely did they include visits during the noon evening meals, and never at times when patients were being put to bed. My visits had basic agendas to visit, read Scripture, pray, share moments of memory, laughter, sadness, insight, delight, hope and mercy. Almost always, I would come and leave according to my

schedule for that day. We live more than 400 miles from my wife's parents. Our holiday visit this year was spent in the convales-cent home. We joined Grandma V in her daylong visits with Grandpa V. It unfolded features of care I had pre-

viously taken for granted. Good nursing/convalescent home care is good, basic care for flesh and bone. It has to do with the way people are helped in going to bed at night and getting up in the morning. It has to do with the number of times they are taken to the bathroom. It has to do with the way they are fed has to do with the way they are fed at breakfast, lunch and dinner. It has

at breakfast, lunch and dinner. It has
to do with the way the call-light is
answered and how the people are
dressed and bathed.

Good nursing/convalescent home
care will also take seriously the primary care provider and coordinator.
For all that the nursing/convalescent home is doing for Grandpa V,
and for all that his medical doctor is
expected to do it is still Grandma V. expected to do, it is still Grandma V who is the primary care provider and coordinator for Grandpa V Good nursing/convalescent care staff will work carefully and deliberately with the primary care provider and coordinator.

CURRENT statistics suggest an increasing number of nursing/convalescent homes in the years ahead Hopefully, there will also be an increasing number of people visiting bring moments of joy and delight to those who live and work in nursing/ convalescent homes, but for every moment that one visits to unfold a personal agenda, there should be anpersonal agenda, there should be another moment that one spends to allow the one being visited that opportunity to unfold their personal agenda. It will take a lot more time, but it will be time that unfolds the level you wanted to bring in the first





The Rocks won the tournament and gained a great deal of confidence in the process. It was, in effect, a giant first step for a young ballclub with four returning players, only one of whom started

Afterward, fifth-year coach Betty Smith asked her team what it had learned during the tourna-

Motoyama, originally from Japan, is a powerful hitter despite her height of 5-foot-6. Her hitting percentage was in the low 90s last year, and she had successful kills 42 percent of the time.

"She's my strongest player, fundamentally," Smith said. "She plays all the way around; she's awesome. She's one of the strongest players in

Salem fights off Ypsilanti

Rocks halt late surge by Braves

When the time clock malfunctioned early in the third quarter Tuesday night, Plymouth Salem got the wrong idea

The basketball game wasn't over yet. Time hadn't expired.

After all but burying Ypsilanti in the first half, the host Rocks fought off a second-half comeback by the Braves to begin 1989 with a 58-46





Michigan State's Walt Bartels may be the ultimate role player.

The sophomore walk-on from Plymouth, who graduated from Redford Catholic Central High, has forged a place on the nation's No. 1ranked hockey team.

And despite a disappointing home-coming last weekend in the Great Lakes Invitational Hockey Tournament (the Spartans were upset by North Dakota), it appears the right winger, who took a regular shift on the third line, is becoming a fixture with the Spartans.

MSU coach Ron Mason has taken walk-ons in the past, but he made it tough for the 5-foot-11, 185-pound Bartels to make the team.

"He's such a quality kid that we had to take a closer look even though I didn't give him much of a chance at first," said Mason. "I thought we

MASON ANEW that Bartels wasn't quite the caliber of another walk-on, Livonian Mike Donnelly, who on eventually worked his way up the ladder to become an All-American with the Spartans, leading MSU to the 1986 NCAA crown. (He is now a member of the Buffalo

But the Spartan coach liked what he saw in Bartels.

"We gave Mike Donnelly more of a chance because he led his Junior A League in scoring," recalls Mason. "The difference between Mike and Walt was that Walt was coming watching them. Many of those guys

Bartels, who has scored four goals and added two assists in the Spartans' first 22 games, admitted, "I just hung on."

"I GUESS YOU could say I got very lucky my first year," he said. "I went to Michigan State because of the school. I thought I was done playing hockey."

Bartels credits his high school coach at Redford CC, Jack Gumbleton, for establishing a work ethic.

"What he (Gumbleton) instilled in me was discipline," Bartels said. "And I also learned what hard work

Before his freshman year, Bartels lifted weights vigorously and skated throughout the summer.

"Going from high school to college is a big jump," Bartels said. "I learned from the older guys by just I'm in awe of and still am. A lot of those guys are now playing in the

Bartels spent a majority of his freshman season on the sidelines, but avoided the ax.

AN HONORS STUDENT at MSU's James Madison College, Bartels spent eight weeks studying in Cambridge, England, focusing on international politics and economics.

But eight weeks in England set his off-season conditioning program

"I ran and did pushups every day, but I was off the ice eight weeks," he said. "I was skinny and I was afraid I wouldn't make the team."

But Mason said Bartels had "right temperment and personality to do a

"He's a plugger who doesn't make any mistakes," said the MSU coach. "And I'm not afraid to put him out there in crucial situations because he never makes mistakes. He also has a great sense of humor."

Bartels is doing his part and has gladly accepted his role.

"Mason has a system and I try to

follow what he says," said the right winger. "Basically I'm a grinder. I don't have many skills, but all I can do is go out and try my best."

THE SPARTANS, minus one of their top scorers, Rod Brind'Amor, away playing in the World Junior Tournament, tried their best in the Great Lakes Tournament, but it wasn't enough to heat North Dakota and a hot goaltender named Norm

After the stunning 7-3 loss to the Fighting Sloux, MSU rebounded in the consolation game to beat Michigan Tech, 7-1.

'Not to make excuses, but we had just come off a long break and we hadn't played in awhile," Bartels sald. "North Dakota had come off playing a Russian team and their tempo was faster than we expected. And their goalie (Dickson) played

"Against Tech we tried to show that we had a talented team and could play better. There was no vendetta. We just knew we could play better than the first night."

The MSU coaching staff hasn't talked yet with Bartels about putting him on scholarship, but the Plymouth native believes that will take

"IT WOULD BE nice because I'm paying a lot of money to go to school right now," he said. "But I can't complain. My job is to go to school and study. And one of my favorite things is hockey. Each day I look forward to spending those two hours on

With that type of attitude, Bartels is willing to sacrifice in order for the Spartans to win a Central Collegiate Hockey Association crown and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.





DNR is talking turkey (release) program again

ural Resources is talking turkey again. In an attempt to estab-

lish a wild turkey population in southern Michigan, the DNR has been releasing wild turkeys in the southern portion of the state for the past six years. The DNR's 1987-88 inter census indicated there were 3,188 birds scattered throughout Region III - roughly, the section of the state south of Bay City.

A couple more turkey releases are scheduled this winter at sites in outhern Michigan - Oxford Township in northern Oakland County and London Township in Monroe County. Twenty wild birds are scheduled

to be released at each site. Birds for the Oakland County release will come from Iowa while the birds for the Monroe County release will be transplanted from the Waterloo Recreation Area near Jackson.

"The whole project is aimed at es-ablishing wild turkeys in a natural habitat in southern Michigan," exained Dave Luukkonen, wildlife District. "We want to re-establish the birds for viewing opportunities and possibly hunting opportunities in the future.

Since 1983, birds have been resed at 19 locations in southern Michigan including the Rose Lake State Game Area (SGA), Flat Rock SGA, Three Rivers SGA, Deford SGA, Lapeer SGA, Barry SGA, Seven Lakes State Park (Holly) and the Waterloo Recreation Area.

SOME OF THE best results have come from the Waterloo site. Between the spring of 1983 and


January of 1984, 37 turkeys were released at Waterloo. By last winter, the flock had grown to better than

"That is a productive flock, for sure," Luukkonen said of the birds at Waterloo. "All of the releases haven't (multiplied) like that. I'd say that is a very good release."

The success at Waterloo has enabled the DNR to transplant some of those birds to the Monroe release site. There will also be a limited spring hunt at the Waterloo site this

The two upcoming releases (Oakland and Monroe counties) will take place on private land.

"Our number one priority is to find suitable habitat for the turkeys," explained Luukkonen. "But we didn't want to single out release sites just on state land either. We



have a group of land owners in both areas (Oakland and Monroe) that are very supportive of the release. They'll be able to monitor the birds and are interested in protecting them from poaching."

THE EFFORT to re-establish wild turkeys in the woodlands and farm lands of Michigan has been a suc-

Through the late 1800's the eastern wild turkey was abundant in southern Michigan. But as the population grew, land was cleared and turkey habitat was destroyed. By the early 1900s the wild turkey was believed extinct in Michigan.

In 1954 the DNR began its effort to re-establish turkeys in the state by releasing 50 birds from Pennsylvania in the Allegan State Game Area in the northern Lower Penninsula. Additional releases were made throughout the northern Lower Penninsula over the next 10 years and by 1964 the flock in northern Michigan had reached 2,000 birds. Last year's winter census indicated that the size of the flock has now grown to better than 34,000 birds statewide.

20 years later

Engineer turns art into bigtime operation

ALBERT SCAGLIONI, FOUNDER of Park West Gallery of Southfield, spoke of his 20 years of selling art, his thoughts moved quickly from past to future.

In two decades he made the leap from owner of a mall gallery on Nine Mile near Telegraph to president of the corporation which operates one of the largest, if not the largest gallery in the country.

The current gallery, 29469 Northwestern, is 5,000 square feet of display space; counting warehouse and offices it hits a rather astounding 40,000 square feet.
"I've been around a lot, and I haven't seen anything

remotely this size," said Scaglioni as he stood in the main floor gallery looking down to the huge gallery below with its 27 foot ceiling. Instead of the usual one or two works per wall, there were many on each wall by a variety of artists. It is a 20th anniversary show of works by artists whom the gallery regularly shows such as Andras Markos, Agam, Laszlo Dus, Picasso, Erte, Chagall, Rembrandt, Manuel Robbe and Harold Alt-

"It's incredible we ended up with 500 pictures plus sculpture and ancient documents," said Scaglioni, adding that he was skeptical at first of the mixture and using so much at one time.

that way all the time . . . people stay longer. People say this is the way it should be hung. Instead of 30 minutes, they may stay three hours. It was a surprise to me. It's a real change for Park West Gallery. I'm gonna go with it."

HE SAID THE eclectic taste level of the gallery's clients has been influential in the change as well. Cliist painting by Markos hanging beside a French impressionist work, a Chagall or a Rembrandt.

"This," he said, "also allows the client's own taste to dominate. They gravitate to things they like and are less inhibited and less intimidated."

Scaglioni, who has been pouring all of his efforts and extensive talents into this gallery business for two decades and, in particular, whipping this larger than life gallery operation into shape, said he plans to turn the day-to-day operation over to his staff. He will continue to head the corporation and make the exhibition and acquisiton decisions.

"It will be a slow withdrawal, but the image of the company will never change as long as I'm alive. " he

He said, "This is a place for me to display and sell things that have taken me 30 years to collect. I was an avid collector for 10 years while I was teaching and very recently I've come to grips with the enormity of

'It's gone over so well, we may keep several gallery our collections . . . I can give you the history and circumstances of each piece of art I bought."

Before becoming a gallery owner, Scaglioni, who has a doctorate in mechanical engineering taught at Michigan State University and Wayne State. He grew up in New York City in the midst of a family who loved classical music, opera and especially art. Art collecting came as naturally as walking or talking.

And it didn't surprise him at all (possibly everybody else) that his engineering and mathematical skills translated immediately and well to the art business.

For instance, the gallery is now in the final stages on cataloguing everything about each work of art and each artist on an IBM AS 400 computer. Each work of art is marked with a bar code. Using this system, the gallery can produce a catalogue for a major exhibition in a few hours. The corporation has a printing business which will open soon a few doors from the gallery in Park

A COMPUTER THIS SIZE is an invaluable tool in a business which is so international in scope and so dependent upon the fine details about hundreds of thousands of different items.

Scaglioni said he and his wife will spend more time in their home near Puerta Vallarta, Mexico. When there he loves to swim in the ocean and go horse back riding. Still, one of the major attractions, in addition to the

setting, 700 feet on top of the mountain "with 500 miles of jungle at my back" and the climate, is the telescope which he has on the roof of his home. Astronomy is

another all-comsuming interest. Between them they have two daughters and two sons and while the young women aren't interested in the gallery, Scaglioni's son Mark, 19, and his stepson, John, 24, are. Both work there parttime.

Scaglioni said he has had many lucrative offers for alternative uses for the building, but he isn't interested. The location is highly desirable.

"If I wanted to pick a tougher place to build a big gallery (than metropolitan Detroit), I don't know where it would have been. New York would have been easier. Chicago would have been easier But, I couldn't have picked an easier place than Northwestern High-


TO ANALYZE HOW he went from a small gallery with a few employees to 5,000 square feet of display space and 40 employees is another story. But, as he looks back Scaglioni is certain about one thing, "People began to buy when I started to talk about the art and the artist." And still today, he said, "We know a lot about the objects we offer."

And his personal collection? What does he have on the walls of his house? It looks a lot like the gallery, he said, he buys what he likes for both.

Me? Well, I'm going to lose weight and get my cho-lesterol level down. I'm going to sculpt and paint I'm going to travel more. Take better photographs. I'm even going to brush Tiffany, my standard poodle, every week at

I believe in goals. I must always have a goal. Did you ever hear the saying, "If you aim at nothing, you'll hit it every time." I even need a deadline for artwork and writing. If I receive a commission and the customer says, "When you find the time," I interrupt and say, "No, I'm sorry, but I have to work on a deadline or pickup date." Why? Because I know me and "me" will never find the time.

So I know "me," but do you know "you?"

Are you the artist who has for 10 years only worked a black and white or one-color medium? Are you one who sells paintings but lacks background in the drawing media? Are you secretly afraid that you will be asked to draw people? Do you fear the commercial commission? Have you ever wondered about sculpture or anatomy but feared you weren't good

Well, come on then, make some resolutions. Set some goals and them make the commitment. Remember the word commitment means "no alternatives" or otherwise stated: Go for it!

What if all you need is a start? Maybe just finding a spot of your own somewhere in the house to do your art. Perhaps your talent is apparent but you lack the technical know-how. Perhaps all you may need is some encouragement from your family or friends. Artists are usually sensitive and their art is dendent on the maintenance of that condition. So the push to begin or change subject/media often comes from loved ones.



By the way, I said "sensitive" and not touchy. Touchy artists may just as well hang a sign around their necks that reads: "Hi, I'm a touchy-artist. I am insecure and will never improve in my ability or attitude." You see, you never know until you are

exposed to a learning situation.

Honestly, I would be the most miserable of all men if I thought I had to pretend to myself or others that I knew it all. I learned early on the very good feelings of the phrase, "I don't know," and the challenge of the following phrase, "but I will find out."

It is true that this year many of the circumstances and situations in which you will find yourself are out of your control. It is also true that many of this year's situations and circumstances are a result of your decisions and commitments. So make this the year you decide to expand your art.

In the meantime, from all of us at the Art Store & More, have a happy and healthy New Year.
