Then they discovered the Illinois company to which they'd paid \$5,200 had suddenly discontinued operations - without completing arrangements for their Nov. 29 reunion or refunding graduates' money.

NONE OF THE 28 Detroit-area clients of Reunions, A Class Organization, Inc. were notified the company was experiencing financial difficulties. Instead, reunion committees received an undated letter from Asset Recovery Services, Inc. of Glenview, Ill. that said, "We regret to inform you that Reunions has been forced to terminate its operations. Declines in reunion attendance this year due to the current economic recession resulted in a traumatic reduction in revenues which finally caused the company to close."

In addition to paying all up-front costs, Reunions booked halls and caterers, located class members, contracted photographers and florists, and hosted reunions. Until now the company enjoyed a good track record with area schools.



A cousin, Sandy Langer, is standing nearby packaging the cut meat. Three shots ring out from the room with the bull.

Michael, Starr's 14-year-old son, watches as his grandfather shoots. 'We'll bleed him, raise him, skin

him and gut him," Boyer said. Minutes later Michael brings in a baby goat shaking from the chill outside where it was penned in next to the slaughter house. Lambs, sheep, goats, pigs and other animals are

"Sometimes I get attached," Michael admitted adding that in

those cases he doesn't watch the kill-

Most of the cows and pigs are raised in Canton at the Wilkins and Gill farms, both longtime Canton families and a close ride from the slaughter house.

THE BOYERS started the butchering business after they sold Boyer's Market, at Michigan and Denton, a few miles from their

There's so much deer business this time of year that the family celebrates Thanksgiving at Christmas, Starr said, jeering at her father.

They're so busy they can't take

They expect to process 1,000 deer

any more bulls or cows until the end of the year, Boyer added.

Some customers bring their animals in to be slaughtered. Others just want the carcass to be butchered. And others can walk to the fenced in area, pick out a live animal and specify how they want it cut. Still others want to kill their own animals.

All the cuts are to the customer's likings. That's especially appealing to people who are following religious traditions, like some Middle Eastern customers who specify exactly how they need their meat cut.

We had a fella today who had to have a goat for the birth of a baby," Carole Boyer said.

THE HEAD HAD to be facing northeast, Larry Boyer added.

Meanwhile, another customer, Gurdatar Singh, of Lincoln Park, is talking to Bob Boyer.

He chose a live goat the previous day and was back now that the animal was processed.

'When I go to the store, I don't know what the meat is," he said. When I come here, I select the goat and he'll cut it the way I like it.' Other customers raise their own

animals and bring them to the

Boyers to be processed. This practice is becoming more popular from growing fears about chemicals fed to animals before they go to market, Boyer said. As for the recession, he added, "It makes no difference to us. We're

busy all year long. In fact, it might help. Some people may want to raise their own. In the fall and winter deer processing predominates. In the sum-

mer it's barbecued pig, Carole Boyer said. You name it. They process it. Deer, bear, antelope, buffalo, elk and

moose are some of the animals. University of Michigan scientists

come by for animal blood, eyes, bones and hearts for experiments, Starr said. Bob Boyer has a theory about

whether the animals know their fate once they're near the slaughter room, "Only four animals know when they're going to die: Elephants, fish, whales and lions."

### Senate caps malpractice damages

tions rejoiced as the state Senate assed the final two bills in an "affordable health care" package.

The bills would cap nearly all "pain and suffering" jury awards at \$250,000 and set up five regional boards as alternatives to courts in malpractice cases. They also cap attorneys' fees.

"We are particularly encouraged that the Senate realized the devastating effects of our current medical liability system on access to health care," said Spencer Johnson, Michigan Hospital Association president.

"At Senate hearings around the state this summer and fall, the medical liability crisis was singled out again and again as a major cause of higher health care costs and reduced availability of health care services.

THE 26 BILLS are now before the House of Representatives, where hopes are dim because of Michigan Trial Lawyers Associa26-bill package now heads to state House for debate

"We urge members of the House to act on these bills promptly, since access to health care is jeopardized each day a solution is postponed," said Eugene Oliveri, Farmington Hills osteopath and president of the Michigan Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons. "It is the patient and the general public who will gain most from the medical liability reforms included in this package.

SB 248 passed 26-10, and SB 249 passed 25-11. All area members voted the same on both bills.

### State cuts affect county seedling program

Wayne County's largest tree sale program could be chopped down by tighter state budgeting.

Wayne County Soil and Water Conservation District tree sales could be eliminated due to state budget cutbacks. An estimated 115,000 seedlings were sold this year in spring and fall sales, district administrator

Faye Long said. Tree sales help support area soil and water conservation districts, which primarily serve farmers. Offices in heavily urban areas, such as Wayne County, have also designed water retention ponds and wild life habitats near factories and offices

Because of Wayne County's dwindling farm land, officials said the downtown Wayne soil and water district office could be consolidated with the Ann Arbor office. The local office has two full-time workers.

Staff hours are already being cox, district chairman Thomas Gill said.

Districts have traditionally been financed through the state Department of Agriculture. The state's 83 conservation districts seek \$1.3 million in state financing. Gov. John Engler has recommended \$1.1 million, though district officials said that money depends upon a supplemental

#### A Man's Gotta Do What A Man's Gotta Do

All young men have one responsibility in common. They have to register with Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. All it takes is five minutes at any post office to fill out a simple form. So if you know a young man about to turn 18, remind him to register. It's one of those things he's got to do.

The state Senate wants a law to punish people who threaten the life of the governor, lieutenant governor, member of the Legislature or their

Senate Bill 377 goes to the House

after 27-9 passage last week. Violation would be a penalty punishable by up to four years in prison and a maximum \$2,000 fine.

"Elitist," objected Sen. George Hart, D-Dearborn. "Members of Congress don't have this. This is an elitist type of law that sets you apart from the citizenry of the state.

"You are not different; you are not better. You took it upon yourself to come here voluntarily, and if the fire is too hot, let's get out of it."

### New county jail set to open next week

Inmates will enter the new Wayne County Jail for the first time one week from today - three years after county voters approved a tax increase to finance its construction.

The \$61-million Hamtramck facility was completed just slightly behind deadline, but \$50,000 under budget. It includes space for 840

The new jail is designed for misdemeanor offenders, freeing up space in the county's downtown jail for felony suspects awaiting trial and convicted felons awaiting

An estimated 1,500-2,000 inmates are released early each year due to overcrowding at the old jail, Wayne County Sheriff Robert Ficano said.

Though the low security jail isn't designed for dangerous criminals, Ficano said some felons may yet be sent there.

"WHEN IT comes down to hard decisions, judges may send some felons here," he said.

Accountability is stressed for all inmates, regardless of crime.

"We're telling people that if you've ever been in jail before, forget it," sheriff's department Commander Malcom Thompson said. "This is a new facility with a new degree of responsibility.'

Responsbilities extend to cleaning and maintaining their cell, repaying the county for medical care - if they can - and participating in substance abuse counseling, if

necessary.
Unlike the old jail, both men and

women will eventually be housed at the Hamtramck jail. All inmates admitted next week will be men, women's cell blocks won't be open until early next year.

The new jail is being billed as state-of-the art, with computerized records and round-the-clock video monitoring.

Deputies will be able to call up an inmate's complete record, including video picture, at the touch of a button. It is believed to be the most extensive video record-keeping system in any jail in the state.

At the same time, areas inside and outside the jail are monitored in a central command room. Deputies keep watch through a system that includes 70 cameras and 10 video screens.

and steel doors at the new jail, but you have to look hard to find them.

Most cell blocks feature wooden doors. There are no barriers between the 60 inmates and deputy in-command.

Inmates won't spend too much time in the cell block, though.

Most will be assigned jobs. Some will work in the vast kitchen, where as many as 20,000 meals a day will be prepared for both county jails, as well as the county youth home. Others will work in the laundry, where as much as 800 pounds of clothing and sheets will be washed in an hour.

Those who work at either spot can earn job training certificates to be presented potential employ-


Inmates will also be encouraged to sign up for adult education classes to be taught by Hamtramck Schools personnel, perhaps working toward a high school equivalence degree. Those who attend classes will be given time off their sentence.

After being brought to the jail, inmates are escorted to a waiting room, not much different from an airport gate.

But it is a jail. Unruly incoming inmates are escorted into glass-enclosed holding rooms, separate from others.

A grim, 32-cell isolation unit, with concrete floors instead of carpeting and metal benches instead of wood, awaits especially troublesome inmates.

For most inmates, though, the philosophy is to keep busy, learn their lessons - and turn their life

### Reps back move to keep drug money for schools

Many Republican lawmakers joined state House Democrats in asking Gov. John Engler to back away from his effort to give \$12 million in federal aid to his drug czar, Bob Peterson, and take it away from the state Department

of Education. The House of Representatives Thursday gave 78-27 support to a resolution by Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City, that "respectfully" asks Engler to halt the fight.

"They (Engler's staff) made a mistake," said Rep. Susan Munsell, R-Howell, backing Keith's resolu-

Supporting it were Republicans Lyn Bankes of Livonia, Barbara Dobb of West Bloomfield, Georgina Goss of Northville, Tom Middleton of Ortonville and Gordon Sparks of Troy, along with all area Democrats.

Opposed were Republicans Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills and John Jamian of Bloomfield Town-

KEITH SAID Engler's executive order would "take federal drugfree school money from the state Department of Education and give it to the drug czar.

"When Congress passed it in 1986, it was heavily debated whether the money should go through governors or schools. It's ironic that (Massachusetts' Democratic Gov. Michael) Dukakis fought the hardest for the money to go the governors.

"Congress wanted it to go to the

classrooms to teach children what would happen if they used drugs. It's pointed out 18 specific times that 30 percent went to the governors and 70 percent to the state educational agencies to distribute to local school districts.

"The state has distributed it through the Michigan Model (for Comprehensive Health Education). Some 525 of 564 (public) school districts and 144 private schools have chosen the Michigan Model for doing away with drug use," Keith said.

TO PETERSON'S charge that schools are misusing drug funds to teach kids to brush their teeth, Keith replied, "Youngsters should know that drug use leads to the deterioration of teeth and gums."

Keith said Engler's compromise plan to set up a drug board with three members of the State Board of Education would "subordinate" the state board.

Don Sweeney, director of the Michigan Model program in the Department of Education, said the health program was chosen as the vehicle for school anti-drug pro-

"We have done an analysis, and 74 percent of the material included in health education is aimed at keeping kids from abusing drugs

or alcohol," Sweeney said.



### CC rips **Pontiac** in grid playoff

After teasing Redford Catholic Central football coach Tom Mach on his first run from scrimmage Saturday, senior fullback Dan Gusoff spent the rest of the afternoon pleasing CC's coaching staff.

Gusoff fumbled his first handoff from quarterback Chris Barbara, but finished with a career-high 138 yards on 24 carries as CC beat Pontiac Central, 37-15, in a Class AA firstround playoff game at Pontiac's Wisner Stadium.

CC lost fumbles on its first two possessions of the game and Mach wasn't in the mood to see another, especially with CC already trailing 8-0 on Louis Adams' 40-yard touchdown run midway through the first

So what did Gusoff do?

HE FUMBLED, only this time the ball bounced right back up to the 6foot, 230-pound senior, and he carried it for a 10-yard gain.

"I didn't think I'd get it again after that," joked Gusoff. "I thought that was it for me.'

Eleven plays later, senior Frank Yoakam capped a 66-yard drive with a 4-yard touchdown run and Brett Walter caught a two-point conversion pass to tie the score, 8-8, and send CC on its way.

"We knew we were far from being out of the game because you can't beat us 8-0," Gusoff said.

The Shamrocks led 23-15 at halftime and scored 22 unanswered second-half points to move their record to 9-1 overall. Detroit Henry Ford beat Dearborn Fordson, 27-17, in the other Region III battle Saturday, setting up a Ford-CC matchup at 1:30 p.m. Saturday at Livonia Clarence-

outgained Pontiac Central, CC 341-48, in total yardage, but suffered five turnovers and had to overcome several penalties before putting away its opponent from the Saginaw Valley League. Gusoff came into the game with 338 yards on 97 carries and seven touchdowns but never had

GUSOFF SCORED on runs of 2, 3 and 8 yards and also recorded a sack from his defensive tackle position, which he shared with teammate Paul Nemzek. Dan Kelly also recorded a sack.

Gusoff was the perfect complement on offense to tailback Jeff Tibaldi, who finished with 112 yards on 21 carries.

"Our offensive line just blew them right out," Gusoff said. "A lot of teams key on Tibaldi. There were just some big holes and I ran the holes."

"Gusoff ran like a real fullback, he got big, tough yards inside, like I was hoping he'd do," Mach said.

The loss ended Pontiac Central's season at 7-3 overall.

Pontiac Central didn't have a full week to prepare for the game after backing into the playoffs late Tuesday when Detroit Mumford was banned from the Region III playoffs for using an ineligible player.

The Chiefs' preparation received another blow after their biggest lineman, 6-foot-3, 275-pound senior Xavier Bond, came down with pneumonia Tuesday and could not play.

PONTIAC CENTRAL trailed 23-15 late in the first half and could have been in better position but failed to score after driving inside CC's 10-yard line in the final minute.

"You can say we could have been, should have been, would have been, but we couldn't match up with their line," Pontiac Central coach Irv Speaks said. "They're fundamentally sound. I wouldn't say they're the best team we've faced, but don't misunderstand, CC is a good ballclub and we couldn't come back."

### Rocks fall short at Adrian

### Missed chance costly

Plymouth Salem's first playoff football game in 14 years ended with the Rocks confused, angry and devastated Friday night.

Losing the Class AA contest 24-19 to host Adrian would have been enough disappointment, but a mistake in the final seconds cost Salem a possible victory and made it even harder to bear.

With time running out, the Rocks had the ball on the Adrian 2-yard line with fourth down coming up.

Salem hurried to line up for one last play, but the players and coaches thought it was third down. Quarterback Pete Zantop - as he was instructed to do in the two-minute offense - threw the ball away. stopping the clock but denying the Rocks another shot at the end zone.

Confusion reigned for the next half minute with :01 still on the clock.

THE PLAYERS stood frozen in place, unsure of what the situation was. Salem coach Tom Moshimer argued for another play since the stadium scoreboard had indicated it was only third down.

The officials talked it over and ruled it was Adrian's ball. Quarterback Mark Arbaugh fell to a knee, ending the game.

Emotions boiled over temporarily when players exchanged words in the end zone. Both benches rushed the field, but order was quickly restored.

"The clock said it was third down, and we couldn't see the down box," a frustrated and emotional Moshimer said. "How the hell can I keep track if the down box is over here (at the corner of the field)? I have to rely on that (the scoreboard). But it's our responsibility to know that. That was my fault."

The Rocks began their unsuccessful drive at their 23 with just under 21/2 minutes remaining. Zantop, who was 6-of-12 passing for 118 yards, completed four of eight passes on the possession. A halfback pass from Ed Gundry to Leon Hister gave the Rocks a first down at the 7 with

39 seconds to play. "Any time you have a great run-

ning team, you're going to be a little more susceptible to the play-action passes," Adrian coach Al Romano said. "We were playing kinda soft, but I didn't expect them to get down there so fast."

ZANTOP THREW an incomplete pass on first down before fullback Dan Burke carried for 4 yards and Zantop 1, bringing up fourth down.

"We could have just lined up and run the same play," Moshimer said.
"I thought we had one more down, and we would stop the clock and call the play we wanted. But we didn't stop them and that's the name of the

Salem (7-3) had difficulty containing the Maples and their pass-oriented offense. Arbaugh was 11-of-17 passing for 155 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for another TD.

The Maples had only 12 of their 127 first-half yards on the ground, but they ran a lot of option plays in the second half, giving the ball to wingback Jeremy Padilla, who had 43 of his 48 yards in the second half.

"(Arbaugh) has a problem with his Achilles tendon, and that kept us from running the option more, Romano said. "He had a problem going to his left, but he could run to the right. We said 'Let's just run the counter option to the right unless we need it (to the left)' and that's what got us down to the one-inch line."

The teams traded TDs on the first four possessions of the second half, with the Maples going 67 yards in 11 plays to take a 24-19 lead with 61/2 minutes left. Padilla's 12-yard run put the ball on the 1. After a loss, Arbaugh ran 4 yards for the touch-

ADRIAN (8-2) never made an extra point. A kick was blocked, a pass fell incomplete and two runs failed.

The Maples finished with 84 rushing yards, but Salem had a 283-239

advantage overall. The Rocks ha 155 on the ground and 128 passing. Hister got 84 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries but was well below his average of 179 per game. Burke added 44 on nine attempts.

"He's a great tailback and we had a lot of people around the ball," Romano said. "He got a lot of tough yards. But we wanted to make sure every yard he got was a tough yard, and I think our defense did that.

"We didn't just key on him. That was the secret to it. I think we might have been a little quicker, too, espe-

cially on the perimeter." The Maples scored first when they blocked a punt and Derek DeLand recovered in the Salem end zone ear-

ly in the second quarter. Salem tied 6-6 after Gundry returned the kickoff to the Adrian 28. The Rocks scored in four plays with Zantop keeping on the option and running the final 19 yards. John Truskowski's kick was blocked.

Adrian led 12-6 at halftime, Arbaugh completing five passes on the next possession, including a 16-yarder to DeLand for the score with 3:42 left in the half.

SALEM DROVE 67 yards in 12 plays with the second-half kickoff to take a 13-12 lead on Hister's 8-yard run and Truskowski's PAT kick.

The Maples responded with another scoring drive. Adrian ran the ball on nine of its 11 plays, and Matt Kennedy scooted the last 3 yards to give the Maples an 18-13 lead.

"I was surprised they could run the ball as well as they did," Moshimer said. "I knew they could throw the ball, but I didn't think they could run the ball on us and they

Salem needed only two plays to regain the advantage, however. On second down, Zantop lofted a screen pass to Burke in the right flat, and Burke managed to tightrope the sideline and go 56 yards for the TD. Zantop's conversion pass was deflected in the end zone, and the Rocks clung to a 19-18 lead early in the fourth quarter.

"Obviously, I thought we played with a lot of intensity," Romano said, comparing the win to the previous game in which the Maples struggled to beat Monroe 12-8. "We were a whole different football team to-

"We played a great football game against a great football program. It was anybody's ballgame and we got the break at the end."

It's a gamble - there's no dodging that. But after weighing the alternatives, the Schoolcraft College hierarchy has decided to send the women's soccer team to the NJCAA Tournament, which begins in 10 days in Trenton, N.J.

The decision was reached Thursday in a meeting between coach Nick O'Shea, athletic director Marty Nowak and assistant dean of physical education Midge It wasn't an easy decision to make, not after two play-

ers were lost to knee injuries in a game played Oct. 20. Nikki Johnson has recovered and resumed practicing last Friday with a brace, but Carol Pietila underwent arthroscopic surgery Thursday to repair a partial liga-Pietila begins rehabilitation today; her status is

doubtful. "There's no telling with rehab," said O'Shea. "Right now, I would have to say she's 50-50.

'Actually, we're not counting on her. We're figuring she won't play. We're making our game plan for 10."

TEN IS the number of players O'Shea will have available if Pietila can't go. Which means the Lady Ocelots will have to play at least two games in two days - and possibly three games in four days — short one player. Going 10-against-11 in a national tournament may

seem foolhardy, but O'Shea believes SC could still reach the finals. "Ten will be a bonus. We haven't had that many for awhile," he said, only half-joking. The Ocelots have been playing short-handed all sea-

son; indeed, they beat Central College (of McPherson, Kan.) 1-0 in a district playoff playing nine-against-11 to earn a berth in the NJCAA Tournament.

The draw favors SC, too. Its first-round match is against Mercer CC, which got an automatic bid as the host school even though its record is mediocre. The top three ranked teams in the NJCAA - No. 1 Meramec (St. Louis), No. 2 Anderson (Anderson, S.C.) and No. 3 Farmingdale (N.Y.) - are all in the opposite bracket, meaning SC could only meet them in the final.

O'SHEA FIGURES his team (ranked fifth) can adjust and has the ability to stay in the game with any of the others, even short-handed. "Defense is not a big problem because we don't play man-to-man. We play a zone," he said.

'Offensively, (playing short-handed) will be frustrating because we'll only have one player to make a run instead of two."

That single forward will probably be Shannon Meath, unless Johnson - normally the center-midfielder lacks enough mobility to handle her normal position.

O'Shea realizes the gamble he's taking. "I really felt bad for the second-year players," he said. "I mean, they did qualify to go. 'It was a tough decision. One or two injuries, and this

could turn into a nightmare. But things could go really well, too. "I think all our bad luck must be used up by now. It's

got to be. Things have to start going our way. If their fortunes do indeed change for the better, SC

could pull off one of the most shocking upsets in NJCAA history.

SC CROSS COUNTRY: Nikole Kenney helped SC's women's cross country team finish second at the Eastern Conference Championships, a single point ahead of Oakland CC, Wednesday at Macomb CC. Kenney's fifth-place finish in 19:55 qualified her for

the NJCAA Championships Saturday in Wichita, Kan. Macomb won the conference meet easily, sweeping the top three spots and scoring 22 points. SC placed sec-

ond with 51 points; OCC had 52. Other Ocelots to score were Leah Bennett, eighth (20:31); Cathy Lenaghan, 11th (21:05); Kristie Cieslek, 14th (24:05); and Kelly Gray, 15th (25:00).



### 'Homicide:' An intelligent thriller

Like any good detective thriller, "Homicide" is as much about the hero's battle with himself as it is about the fight against bad guys. Written and directed by David Mamet, this highly intelligent thriller has opened wide after a successful exclusive run at Bloomfield's Maple Theatre.

Joe Mantegna plays Joe Gold, an inner city police officer with a long list of citations. On the way to a big case, he stumbles upon the routine murder of a candy store owner, an elderly Jewish woman. First on the scene, he is forced to "babysit" the case, even though his interests lie

elsewhere. The victim's family immediately senses his disinterest. Feeling guilty, Gold swears he will find the killer. As he probes deeper and deeper into the possible motivations behind her mufder, he must face his obligation to both the Jewish and law enforce-

ment communities. "Homicide" is the third feature from Mamet and it may be his best. The talented playwright turned film director has a unique way of turning old movie cliches into something incredibly fresh.

THE FRUSTRATIONS of police bureaucracy, even the standard suspense gimmicks that are the stuff of every TV cop show become emotionally charged again.

That's because Mamet serves up such complex characters. For 20 years, Gold has experienced anti-Semitism on the force. His feelings of inadequacy have made him the boldest, gutsiest cop around, "always the first one through the door" in an intense situation.

Throughout the course of the film, which is set just over two days, Gold gets no sleep. He investigates the murder scene shortly before dawn and discovers clues, including an empty machine gun case in the candy store basement. It becomes apparent that the old lady ran firearms



# Preserve bounty for winter

With the official word coming down from the Department of Natural Resources, this hunting season might go down as the best on record. And if Mother Nature holds up her end, this year should find a majority of hunters with freezers loaded up for the projected, long, hard winter.

So what if you are really lucky in the field? Let's face it, there are only so many ways to properly preserve and store hunting bounty properly. Here are some suggestions that will ensure a safe, efficient method of preservation.

RIGHT OFF the bat, check the condition of the freezer. Every type of refrigerator or freezer has a warm air outlet which must be kept clear. If the freezer is too close to a wall, for example, the warm air outlet may be blocked. This will cause overheating and long, laborious operation of the cooling unit, giving you unnecessarily high electricity bills. Also, make sure the freezer is out of the direct path of a heat source, such as a warm air register or sunlight.

Be sure the door of the unit is airtight. A good test is to close it on a piece of paper. If the paper comes out easily with a light pull, cold air is leaking out, and the door gasket should be replaced or the door latch readjusted.

The biggest mistake owners of manual defrost freezers make is to allow too much ice build-up to occur. Frost and ice cut cooling power, never allow more than ¼ inch ice or frost to form inside the unit.

We all know the importance of keeping the condenser coils free and clear of dust and dirt. Seasonal vacuuming solves this

problem. Even though my home economics teacher will never agree, I must, in all honesty say that the longer the wild game is aged before using, the better it will taste. Venison can hang for 10 to 15 days if a temperature of 34-40 degrees is properly maintained. Game birds can also benefit from aging, improving what is normally a gamey taste. Aging allows the natural enzymes an opportunity to tenderize the meat. Avid hunters have refrigerators used solely for this

ANOTHER POPULAR method for preserving wild game is the smoker. Fish, fowl and just about any wild game can also be smoked, not simply for the addition of a new flavor, but also for extended storage. Any avid large game hunter will have access to an old refrigerator with the motor and condensor removed, a fire box inserted underneath and a few strategically placed holes for a do-it-yourself smoker. A few hot coals and some dried hardwood like applewood or hickory and the old racks inside the fridge never worked so well.

Venison or duck sausage, coho salmon and even trout are easily smoked. If you don't have access to an old refrigerator unit, regular smokers can be easily purchased at any fireplace shop or outdoors store.

Jerky is a chewable treat treasured by many hunters. Thin strips of any wild game are marinated in a brine solution for several hours and then dried and/ or smoked.

When it comes to wrapping your game for the freezer, remember that air is what you don't want. Freezer wraps, plastic freezer bags and burpable airtight containers such as Tupperware work best.

Be sure to label your packages as to the type of eat, cut, weight and the date. Venison and game birds can be kept 8-12 months

Duck and turkey should be kept no longer than six months and most fish, especially fatty fish are best eaten within two months of freezing.

Tracking down cooking methods for hunter's feast

RYING TO track down wild game hunters to interview for a cooking story this time of year is like finding prime rib on sale at the supermarket; it's virtually unheard of.

From September through April scads of wild game hunters venture iroughout Southeastern Michigan and into the great north woods in search of anything that walks, crawls, flies, jumps, swims or even hangs from trees all the while toting enough firepower to fuel restaurant stoves for days on end.

There's little argument that most of the hunters are in search of deer, with a growing loyalty to duck, pheasant and wild turkey, but while researching this story, yours truly stumbled across hunters who actually search out porcupines, opossums, raccoon and even muskrat. Worse yet,

they eat them.

Anyone in Metropolitan Detroit who's into food knows that the area's premier authority on wild game is the venerable Chef Milos Chielka of the Golden Mushroom Restaurant in Southfield. Chef Milos has long been an avid wild game hunter who is as comfortable in the deep woods as he is in a \$200,000 stainless steel kitchen. When not stalking deer, Chef Milos can be found hunting other wild game favorites: partridge, woodcock, duck and grouse.

What I thought would be a "quickie" five minute interview between lunch and dinner at the Golden Mushroom turned into a 45-minute discussion on the joys of wild game hunting, and what a little braising, roasting, wine, stock and vegetables can do to a breast of partridge or a leg of

One of the many points of information derived from our discussion was Chef Milos' Insistence that for wild game to

be good in your kitchen, it must be aged and mellowed.

"Deer should be properly field gutted and then allowed to hang in a cold location for up to three weeks for optimum flavor" claims the notable chef. "As a matter of fact, I have two ducks mellowing in a paper bag in the meat keeper of my home refrigerator, and a six-pointer hanging in the garage at this very moment" he continued, "just waiting to be cleaned and sprinkled with 'the game spices' and then roasted to perfection."

For the unknowing, Chef Milos' "game spices" include a mixture of allspice, bayleaf and thyme.

While not even considering the option of telling this writer where he was so lucky to hunt, Chef Milos was very generous in his offering of cooking procedures for optimum wild game taste and flavor.

"Since wild game is essentially wild, there is little fat," said Milos. "Tougher cuts of venison like the rump and roast benefit from a moist heat cooking procedure requiring the braising of the meat and the addition of either wine or stock with some vegetables and a slow roast for several hours."

"Whole game birds can be roasted, but are best cut up again with the legs and wings braised at a long, slow roast, and the breast portions wrapped and tied with pork fat and being roasted at a high temperature (450 degrees) for as little as 20 minutes or so."

Unfortunately, there are some of us who are not quite as talented in the kitchen as Chef Milos and turn the cooking of wild game over to their spouses only after the initial

processing is completed.

For the spouses of great northern hunters who are saddled with the task of cooking up 125 pounds of venison or a dozen ducks, cooking techniques and recipes are too few and far between. I spoke with the wives of some area hunters. They echoed virtually the same culinary thoughts: "It's

not what you do to the wild game; it's what you do with it that counts."

One takes some of the toughest cuts from the hind quarter and sends it to her favorite butcher who, with the addition of some fat and spices, turns otherwise tough venison into lovely sausage that can be broiled, baked, casseroled, sandwiched and microwaved.

Another, a devoted fan of Chef Milos and the Golden Mushroom, prefers to use the old standby clay cooker (Romertopf) for a slow, moist cook with potatoes, onions, turnips and rutabagas. "I make everything from roasts to barbecued venison in the clay cooker, most of the time with a splash of cheap red wine and a little Lowry's Seasoning Salt" was her proud response.

For the uninitiated wild game cook, there is plenty of information available at the local library and through your local county extension service. One of the best sources for wild game recipes, however, is a book entitled, "Wildlife published by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs, Box 30235, Lansing, Michigan 48909. Another excellent source is "Jack Ubaldi's Meat Book," by Jack Ubaldi and Elizabeth Crossman, copyright, 1987 by MacMillan Publishers. Last, but certainly not least, Chef Milos has put his many years of culinary expertise with wild game on paper just for Observer/Eccentric readers. This packet contains information on care of animals and small game after the hunt, dressing and great recipes from Chef Milos himself. #### Field dressing your deer

### How to preserve taste, quality of venison

Let's face it, field dressing your deer is the least favorite aspect of the hunt. But it can also be the most important part of the hunt in terms of the taste and quality of the venison. If you do a half-hearted job and "leave the rest for the processor", you will undoubtedly tarnish and/or loose a bundle of meat.

Once the animal is dead and the proper license attached, the first thing to do is field-dress the carcass. If you've never performed the task, get someone who has to show you the proper technique. If you just go in hacking away you'll likely do more damage than good. There are also video's out on the market that take a hunter through the entire process

step by step.

It's wise to throw a pair of rubber or plastic gloves in with your hunting gear so you have something to wear while you dress the animal. The gloves not only make cleaning up a little easier, but they are also a good precautionary measure to protect yourself against contacting

Lyme disease.

Lyme disease is transmitted to the human blood stream through the bite of a deer tick. It is not known if the disease can be transmitted through contact with deer blood alone, but it's better to be safe now than sorry later.

THE BIGGEST THING to remember is to get everything out of the carcass.

"A lot of people don't completely field-dress their deer," said Susan Reed, of Reed's Deer Processing in Rochester. "They don't get everything out and that's what you have to do. Sometimes people don't split the pelvic bone and remove the bladder and that's something you should do right from the get go."

Hunters often hang their deer for too long. Many people believe a deer should hang for a several days so the blood will drain and the meat won't

"It's good to hang the deer for a little while to let the blood run out, but not for two or three days," said Jack Smith, who has been processing deer at the Regal Market in WestIt pays to take a little time and patience when you dress and transport your deer so your venison will be top quality when it finally gets to the table.

Picken's Meat Market 53 E. 14 Mile Rd., Clawson Phone: 588-1669 land for 20 years. "If you hang a deer in warm weather it will spoil, and if you hang it in cold weather it will freeze. Most of the blood will drain out in about a half-hour. After that, hanging the meat really doesn't do anything to it.

"You don't have any control over the temperature, either," added Smith. "It may drop down to 32-degrees at night then jump up to 60degrees during the day. That's not good for the meat."

IF YOU CAN'T get your deer to a processor for a day or two, hunters should be sure to keep the carcass of the animal cool and free from flys. Leave the hide on and hang the animal in a cool, shady area. If you have one, cover the carcass with a game bag, and keep it out of the sun.

"If the temperature gets up to 40dégrees, I'd say that's a marginal temperature," said Rick French, the new owner of Antlers and Anchors (formerly the American Fishing Center) in Pontiac. French is a taxidermist and will also be processing venison this fall. "If it stays below 40 for a few days you'll probably be OK, but if it gets up around 50 you'd better get it in to a processor.

"If it's warm, you should pack the carcass with ice and get it to a cool area as soon as possible," added French. "It probably won't go bad, but it will have a stronger taste."

Don Francis, of Butcher Boy Food Products in Warren, suggests hunters should be aware of how they transport their game to ensure top quality in their meat.

"Probably 50 percent of the people that bring deer in don't know how to load it," Francis said. "If you strap a deer to your hood the heat from the engine will taint the meat on the bottom side of the deer. Other people strap the deer down with the body cavity facing the front of the car. When they drive down the road they get dirt and bugs all through the inside of the carcass. The best way to load a deer is on the back of a car with the open part facing back."

It pays to take a little time and patience when you dress and transport your deer so your venison will be top quality when it finally gets to the table.

Dip rabbit pieces into cornmeal, then the egg wash, then into the seasoned breadcrumbs. Heat oil in a large frypan until hot. Add breaded rabbit pieces and brown on all sides. Cook until juices run clear, about 10-12 minutes. Drain and enjoy.

VENISON WITH BOURBON

1/2 cup bourbon pounds venison steaks, chops or sliced roasts 1 carrot thin sliced

1 onion, sliced thin

6 whole cloves

1-10 oz. jar red currant jelly salt and pepper to taste

Wash and pay dry venison.

Place in a large non-metallic bowl and cover with bourbon, vegetables and seasonings, but not the jelly. Allow to marinate for at least 3 hours (longer or overnight, if possible). When ready to cook, remove meat and place in a covered roasting pan with the vegetables. Roast the venison for 24 hours at 350 degrees. Brush with a sauce made from the marinade and the jelly mixed together. Internal venison temperature should read 170 degrees.







### Discover the pleasures of port

Port is big, round, full-bodied, sweet and wonderful. A glass of port accompanying dessert or served as the dessert course is an exceptional

Vintage port is the greatest among ports, gets a great deal of hype, represents just 2 percent of the total annual production and is expensive. Not to worry, it is possible to enjoy good port on a regular basis, rather than just special occasions, once you learn that not all port is vintage and

Port is divided into two categories: wood port and vintage port. The former is aged in wood and the latter in the bottle. Vintage ports are produced only in excellent years, blessed with perfect weather conditions. These conditions occur an average of three times each decade.

THE DECISION to "declare" a vintage is made by the shipper with the approval of the Instituto do Vinho do Porto. Vintage port is always blended from wines of the best vineyards, grown in a single year of recognized quality, and has exceptional aroma and taste characteris-

Vintage port ages 2 to 2.5 years in cask; the remainder of its life is spent slowly aging in a black-glass bottle for at least 10 and frequently up to 30 years. Vintage port throws a heavy crust in the bottle and therefore must be set upright for 24 hours and carefully decanted before serv-

MOST CONSUMERS decide to buy port on Friday and open the bottle Saturday. This is exactly why it is important to learn something about wood ports, which are ready to drink when bought. There are no concerns about vintage, age, decanting or the like, and the price is much more rea-

Wood ports are divided by type into ruby, tawny (produced from red grapes), and white. Fermentation is halted by addition of brandy, yielding a sweet wine with 19 to 20 percent alcohol. Young red port is a deep-purple color. It gradually turns ruby (red), then takes on brown hues and eventually becomes tawny (brown or dark amber). Port gains flavors and diminishes in body and color as it ages. It throws a crust in

the cask rather than the bottle. Tawny ports are lighter, more delicate and aromatic, and more expensive than ruby ports due to extended aging in cask. This aging produces a tawny color and a woody, nutty flavor. Better tawny ports have an average age stated on the label. The older wines develop a paler color, lighter body, and carmelized character that is particularly attractive.

VINTAGE-CHARACTER ports are fuller-bodied, mellow rubies, blended from wines of better-thanaverage years. They have some of the characteristics of vintage ports but have been aged in wood, rather than in the bottle, for four to five years. The increased quality of vintage character ports is dependent on the vineyard and year, rather than

The difficulty for the consumer is identifying these wines on the merchant's shelf. Each shipper uses a "signature" name because this type of port is not strictly defined as is

Late-bottled vintage ports are produced from a single, quality harvest, and must exhibit standards established by the IVP. They are asked in cask four to six years and thus have an aged quality compared to vintage ports because they mature faster in cask than in the bottle. These wines are much easier to identify because the label must say Late Bottled Vintage and include both the vintage year and the bottling date.

An opened bottle of port maintains its taste characteristics perfectly for up to a month.

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

The following are quality examples and offer a good introduction to the various types of port.

Taylor, Fladgate First Estate Port (\$15) is a fruity ruby style crafted from traditional port grapes. With aroma of cherry, red plums and currants followed by jammy flavors, it will enhance any fresh fruit dessert accompanied by blue-veined cheeses, particularly stilton.

Delaforce "His Eminiace's Choice" (\$17) is a mature tawny port blended from aged reserve ports ranging six to 30 years old. The dried fruit and nutty character in both the aroma and flavor match it perfectly to a fruit compote dessert.

Quinta Do Noval's Noval Porto LB (\$17) showcases classic vintage character with its rich blackberry and dark red fruit aromas. It is full bodied, generous, smooth, and rich with expressive port character in the fin-

Taylor, Fladgate Late Bottled Vintage Port 1985 (\$18.50) is full, rich, viscous and loaded with cherry-berry fruit. A remarkable depth of flavors lasts through the substantial finish. This is dessert!



Put all ingredients into blender. Blend until well mixed, about 30 to

45 seconds, (or mix with electric blender until well mixed.) Pour pumpkin mixture into pie crust and put into an oven set at 350 degree. Bake for about 1 hour, or until knife inserted into center comes out clean.

You may want to dampen the edges of the pie crust with milk to prevent oven-browning.

It's better in Bahamas with natives

he photograph shows Annis and Emma on the beach in Eleuthera, Bahamas, but it only tells part of the story of my day with the People-to-People Program in the village of Savannah

It doesn't show the children in their white dresses waiting for me at the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church, the crawfish served in the small blue painted house or the moment when I was introduced to the oldest woman in town.

I was the first traveler hosted by the people of Savan-nah Sound, but more than 1,400 Bahamians have hosted visitors for a day or an evening since the People-to-People program started 12 years ago in Nassau and Grand Bahama Island. It has only recently spread to the family islands, as the other Bahamian islands are

A single road, which locals call The Street, runs the 110-mile length of the family island of Eleuthera; the island is less than one mile wide so the road gives alternating views of the Atlantic Ocean on one side and the Caribbean Sea on the other. The people of Savannah Sound live on both beaches.

My hosts Annis Bullard and Emma Sands picked me up in Governor's Harbor, in the center of the island, in time for the morning service at the Bethel AME Church. The last Sunday of every month is Youth Day, so a cluster of young people with scrubbed black faces waited outside the church door: young girls with beaded hair and white frilly dresses, older girls in green, boys in white Sunday shirts.

About 30 parishioners rose in the small church when the youth came clapping and singing up the red carpet-ed aisle to the raised platform that held the altar and the choir loft. They rocked from side to side singing "He has done great things for me!"

Emma's daughter Mary started the service, although three dignitaries sat behind the altar: the Rev. Daniel Scott, presiding elder from Nassau; Commissioner Harrison Thompson, chief government officer of central Eleuthera; and the Rev. Alexander Bethel.

You don't need an organ when senior choirmaster Vernal Gibson is in church. When Mary announced the hymn, Vernal's voice rose from the pew behind me "I am so glad that our father in heaven . . . " Annis and Emma picked it up in resounding voices and the rest followed.

I turned my head and saw several tiny children in pink Sunday dresses asleep on the second pew or watching the service while the fans blew the wildflowers piled in front of the altar.

"Hymn 461." Vernal's voice began. The congregation rose and moved, singing, from one pew to another, shaking hands and hugging in the spirit of the Lord.

Thompson's sermon raised the roof and set the congregation rocking and stamping and shouting. The prodigal son has never had such a storyteller.

"I HAVE COME TO TELL YOU. .

"I HAVE COME TO TELL YOU ABOUT GOING HOME TO THE FATHER . . . "Amen!" "Amen!"

When the service ended, Scott and I were invited back to Annis' house for lunch. Only two places were set at


the table. While we ate crawfish and grouper and macaroni and rice and other tasty island foods, Annis and Emma sat a few feet away in the living room. I protested, uncomfortable, but the two women just smiled.

"These two ladies are used to serving others," Scott said. "They are both chefs at the Windermere Club. Emma served Prince Charles before he was married." After lunch we drove past the houses in the Winderm-

ere Club where the British royal family stays in Eleuthera. Emma and Annis told stories about Prince Charles and Princess Di. They had the same pride in their voices when they stopped beside the road to introduce me to Lillian Culmer, the oldest lady in Savannah

Is People-to-People always like this? I have heard stories about families sharing dinner in Nassau and other stories about guests who sat alone while their hosts cooked behind closed doors in the kitchen. I highly recommend that you try it, however. It is a great way to experience the world.







Be sure to add details such as color, size, condition, brand name, age, features and benefits. Be accurate! Don't embellish your ad with misleading information. Stick to the facts and reap the



4. Include phone number and specify hours. Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a



2. Include the price. Don't waste your time or a potential buyer's time. If you advertise the price of the Item or service you offer, the people who respond to your ad will be those who are genuinely interested. Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.



5. Run on consecutive days. Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative.



3. Avoid abbreviations. Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WSW (white side wall) tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.

# 'Home Improvement' power up to the Nielsen top ten

### Tim Allen plays a tool-happy everyman

Sometimes, a wrench is just a wrench. But on ABC's Tuesday-night comedy "Home Improvement," tools get top billing.

After getting burned two years ago with "Chicken Soup," an attempt to translate New York comedian Jackie Mason's nightclub act to a sitcom living room, ABC has apparently hit the nail on the head with this retooling of series star Tim Allen's one-man stage act into a weekly comedy. In the early weeks of the 1991-92 television season, the show has become a topten hit, drawing a larger audience than "Full House," which precedes it, and proving itself a worthy leadin for "Roseanne," the No. 2-rated series on television.

Allen had an auspicious introduction to national audiences in the Showtime special "Men Are Pigs" and has literally brought the tools of his trade with him to "Home Improvement." If a man's home is his castle, this series maintains. then the garage is his throne room.

Allen plays family-man Tim Taylor, inveterate putterer and host of a television show-within-a-show

titled "Tool Time." Here, Taylor and his skeptical helper, Al (Richard Karn), demonstrate household projects, and Taylor shares his wisdom about all things masculine - an act he can ill afford. Both on and off the air, his neanderthal grunts and woofs and appeals for "more power!" (measured in horses) invariably fail him when crisis strikes, and he must turn to Wilson, the neighbor across the back fence, for help. Unseen from the eyes down, Wilson borrows heavily from poet/culturalist Robert Bly and pop psychology generally to dispense little chestnuts on the male predicament for Taylor.

The only break-out hit of the new season, "Home Improvement" has truly been in the right place at the right time. Not only does it enjoy a showcase timeslot (compare it to NBC's "Eerie, Indiana," which has sunk to around 90th place opposite the second half-hour of "60 Minutes"), but goes straight to the heart of the average man. congratulating him for doing his chores while letting him laugh at handier-than-thou series like PBS' "This Old House.

Carving out a niche at round number eight as measured by the Nielsen calipers, this series makes every other new show look like an also-ran. Its nearest competition, at about number 28 overall, is ABC's "Step By Step," followed closely by

"Homefront" and "Royal Family." "Baby Talk," "The Torkelsons, "Sibs," "Teech," "Brooklyn Bridge," "Drexel's Class," "Herman's Head" and "Roc" are also making respectable showings. "Good & Evil," the first big network series to be canceled, was by no means last at around 77.

In this self-appointed back-tobasics decade, "Home Improvement" lets men see themselves in Allen's character and lets women see their husbandsfoibles and all-through the eyes of his wife, Jill. As played by Patricia Richardson. Jill has a more realistic charm than most rail-thin, overachieving TV moms, and she is evenly matched with Allen in the verbal sparring that is a feature of each episode

But the same themes are addressed better later in the evening by both "Roseanne" and "Coach." Allen's series is distinguished-from "Coach" in particular - by the central character's persistent childishness. from his tool play and his sublimation of libido into horsepower, to his inability to muster more than an it-was-anaccident apology for repeated thoughtless behavior.

Just once, couldn't he put down that nail gun and come out acting






