Church barred from housing homel

The only "points of light" in Plymouth Township this holiday season will be strung outside houses or glowing from sand-filled luminary bags.

Members of a local church wanted to bring a group of 60-65 Detroit homeless to spend a week here in January, as part of an inter-faith effort involving more than a dozen suburban churches

But while several suburban communities including Northville and Livonia have allowed homeless people to be housed in churches in their communities, Plymouth Township's administration has said no

"SOME CHURCHES ARE doing it but are not asking permission from local government," said Gerald Law, township supervisor.

"You hate to be the Scrooge at Christmastime. But when someone formally requests something, we must apply our ordinances - I don't have the power to override ordinances."

In a letter to the church, township attorney Judd Hemming wrote, "Your church was not designed, built or inspected to comply with fire, building and public health laws applicable to multiple family housing.

"The housing of multiple families in a church may result in an extremely dangerous condition for the inhabitants," he continued.

"I think it's quite shocking that the township is legislating what the normal operation of a church should be," said Doug Koenig, a lay leader of First United Methodist Church, 45201

N. Territorial Koenig said most of the church's 1,450 members favor housing homeless at the church.

The request was first turned down in November, "and we were turned down last week again," Koenig said Thursday.

'The homeless problem is a growing local emergency situation," wrote church outreach chairman Ted Kuhns in a letter to the town-

ship requesting approval.

"WHAT THEY'RE asking the township to do is violate the township laws and ordinances and the state statutes," Hemming said. "The township is without any authority whatsoever to act on their request. If you go around making unilateral exceptions, it is dangerous to inhabitants."

Asked how he'd respond to those who would say the township administration's decision is elitist or racist, Hemming said, "I think that's utter nonsense. They (the church) have asked for a legal opinion based strictly on the parameters of the law.

One neighbor of the church, who declined to be named, said that while she understands how people can be forced into homelessness, added. 'I would be concerned about the crime.'


Koenig said several people would be on hand to oversee the homeless staying at the church, adding that other suburbs haven't reported problems from homeless staying in their towns

"It was a wonderful experience," said Sharon Harper, administrative assistant for the First United Methodist Chruch of Northville. "We had them last year, and we'll have them this year." she said.

While she said nearby businesses had been a bit wary, nothing happened. "They're not out walking the streets," she said.

"What do we hope to accomplish?" Kuhns wrote in his letter asking for township approv-

'By our actions, we hope that our guests will realize that someone cares for them," the letter continued.

Landmark clothing store to close doors

First it was Farmer Jack, then the downtown Amoco station, and now

Downtown Plymouth's image took another shot to the chin last week as clothier Fred Hill announced he's closing his Main Street store and his women's store "Me and Mrs. Jones."

A third store owned by Jones, Me and Mrs. Jones Petite store, will remain open. "We've been trying to exist in an environment that will no longer support us, as with the dinosaur," Hill said Wednesday in announcing his plans.

What does another prominent store closing suggest for downtown Plymouth?

"TO ME IT'S going to end up restaurants and narrow specialty stores and offices," said Hill, who is also a member of the city's Downtown Development Authority

'We don't fit at all the picture of what Plymouth is going to be," he said last week. Hill's store Fred Hill Haberdash-

ers opened nearly 24 years ago, offering "better traditional" men's wear priced at "above a moderately priced store," he said.

There was a trace of irony in the timing of Hill's announcement, as it came less than a week after his successful second annual "A Plymouth Thanksgiving" celebration in Kellogg Park.

nouncement. "His enthusiasm is important to the town, I hope he remains enthusiastic about the town.'

To some who first heard Hill was leaving, the announcement suggested more than just another business going down.

That's because Hill has become a positive symbol of Plymouth with his fun, creative promotions, including "A Plymouth Thanksgiving" and his briefcase drill team that appears

in area parades. 'The focus will be the (Me and Mrs. Jones) Petite store for now." Hill said, adding he owns some downtown property and "will be expanding my involvement" in real es-

"I'm still on the DDA, the briefcase drill team will still march," he

Will he eventually leave Plymouth? "I haven't thought that far ahead," Hill, a town resident, said.

An Ohio State University graduate, Hill worked as a buyer for Hudson's before opening his store in 1968. First called John Smith Clothing Co., he opened it with partners Harold Guenther and Jim Houk. "I bought them out a few years later,"

WHILE THE STORE stuck mainly with traditional clothes, Hill laughs when he recalls the fringed suede vests, acetate turtlenecks and wallpaper-print shirts he has carried.

Business-wise, "It was pretty hard



Man dies in Canton crash

A 34-year-old Belleville man died Friday morning shortly after losing control of his car, veering into oncoming traffic and being struck by a tow truck.

Richard Bellanger was driving a 1975 Olds Cutlass south on Canton Center near Ford Road at about 9:12 p.m. when apparently he lost control, spun around and ended up in the north bound lane, according to Canton police Detective Bill Keppen.

A FORD-350 pick-up truck traveling north on Canton Center struck Bellanger's car on the driver's side. The pick-up was hauling another car.

Bellanger, who was not wearing his seatbelt, was alone in the car. No one else was injured as a result of the accident that occurred on icy roads, Keppen said.

The truck driver didn't receive a ticket. Initial investigations show the Preliminary investigations indicate that alcohol was a factor in the accident.

accident appears to have been caused by Bellanger.

Preliminary investigations indicate that alcohol was a factor in the accident. Autopsy results are expected within three weeks, Keppen said. He added that it was difficult to say

whether speed played a role.
"There's no indication that speed is considered a factor," Keppen said. "But when someone loses control of a vehicle the question is always: Was the speed too fast for the conditions?

Bellanger was taken to Annapolis Hospital and died at 12:17 a.m.

• A 25-year-old South Lyon man died in accident when he was traveling west on Ford Road near Ridge. His car crossed the center line and collided with another car. The driver also was legally drunk, autopsy re-



ees' spirits sank when their owner announced at a meeting that he is closing his haberdashery and his Me and Mr. Jones women's store. The Me and Mr. Jones petite store will remain open.

Hill, who has 15 employees, also called a meeting of city officials and local business people to give them the news Wednesday.

CHUCK SMITH WORKED for Fred Hill in the early 1980s and came back to the haberdashery just two months ago.

"It's a big disappointment. This has been such a part of the commu-

nity for so long," said Smith.
"It's kind of sad it happen. But people have an illusion of downtown areas that doesn't fit in like we would hope it would."

A hallmark of Hill's shops is personalized service - something not often found in mall stores. Many of Hill's customers have been clients for 10, even 20 years. Wooden files at the store contain the dates of customers' birthdays and anniversaries.

Personalized birthday greetings are mailed to customers. And the cards are signed, not engraved.

'We kind of felt that the personal attention we gave here made it a lit-tle bit like 'Cheers.' When someone comes in, everyone knows his name, his size, and the suits he likes," said

"When birthdays come up, we'd call a customer's wife and say, 'We happen to have this sweater on sale, or whatever," he said. "We tried to have anniversaries on file, too. If she needed a gift and didn't have time to shop, we'd wrap it and bring it out to the house if it we could make it there and back within a reasonable amount of time.

"It was personal touches like that set us apart from mall stores and strip centers, where you don't have that same warm feeling necessarily," said Smith. "People who were here were consistently here - we would know them and they would know us. We weren't trying to sell them, we just tried to fill the needs they might have when they came in. And the other stores (Me and Mr. Jones and Me and Mrs. Jones Petite) ran on the same principles."

Hill carried a quality line of suits, shirts, ties and casual wear including brands such as Burberry; Ayrshire/ Austin Reed; Ralph Lauren; and Hart, Schaffner and Marx. Custommade suits were sold as well.

A dyed-in-the-wool Buckeye fan, Hill is magnanimous enough to decorate his cozy, well-appointed store with colorful "Wolverine Drive" and "Spartan Avenue" street signs dur-

A gold antique cash register, still used as a change drawer, graces the counter. Adorning the walls are oldtime photos of distinguished-looking

gentlemen outfitted in their finest. Adding to the homey atmosphere are a couple of wall-mounted, wood-

School bomb scare probe continued

Plymouth police say it's still not known what type of liquid was in the Pepsi bottle removed from a locker at East Middle School during Wednesday morning's bomb scare.

The fluid is being analyzed by Michigan State Police, who responded to the bomb threat along with city police and firefighters.

'The matter is still very much under investigation," said Plymouth Police Chief Robert Scoggins. "We have some different angles that

we've looked at. In regards to the device, it could very well be nothing, but it certainly had the appearance of being something, which added credence to the reason we acted the way we did."

THE CONTAINER was taken outside and placed a distance away from the school, which is at 1042 S.

Police said the container found in locker No. 1093 was a clear Pepsi bottle with a cork attached to a yellow string with wax on one end. It contained a clear liquid. Asked whether a disgruntled employee or

someone else has been identified as a suspect, Scoggins said, "We still don't have a concrete suspect at this

The school, attended by 697 students, was evacuated at 9:30 a.m. after an unknown male caller phoned the school secretary at 7:15 a.m. and said, "Listen so you don't screw up. I have put three bombs in the school. The first one is set to go off at 10:05 a.m. I will call back at 9:05 to give my demands for the police to show I'm not f---- around.

The secretary who took the call said she is sure the caller made some other statements, but she was too

Schools face \$5 million shortfall

Wayne Circuit Judge Roland Olzark issued a temporary restraining order Friday permitting Plymouth-Canton Community Schools and other out-of-formula Wayne County school districts to withhold tax-base

sharing payments. Under the tax-base sharing plan, out-of-formula districts in Michigan would contribute revenue to less-af-

fluent districts PLYMOUTH-CANTON'S first payment of \$375,000 was due in mid-December, with the balance of commercial and industrial growth.

At its meeting at 7:30 p.m. tonight at the board office, the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education is scheduled to discuss the 1991-92 budget. The \$72 million budget was passed before the tax-base sharing plan was approved by Lansing, and before the state placed a cap on the social security reimbursements it pays

school districts The added factor of a freeze on property assessments paints a flat revenue picture for next year that \$375,000 due next year. The amount may result in expenditures exceedrepresents half the tax revenue from ing revenues by as much as \$5 mil-

lion, say school officials. Where cuts might be made hasn't yet been decided. Administrators are hopeful new property developments will

Bad economic times looked as bleak as they could get last week when Santa Claus said he was going into the red to meet costs.

But the holiday spirit, through organizations like the Canton Chamber of Commerce, could bail him out.

Gene "Santa" Reaves, 89, has been wearing the red and white uniform of good will and cheer for 60 years. And even though the money isn't coming in this year as quickly as it usually does, he's not giving up.

"I don't give nothing used, and I want to do the buying myself," Reaves said from his Westland

"I'm about \$2,000 in the red this year," Reaves said. "I've been going into my savings account, which doesn't amount to nothing."

BUT EVEN financial woes can't dampen his spirits.

The ho, ho, ho bottom of the tummy laugh echoed over the telephone. He sounded just like you'd imagine Santa Claus would sound while he described his seasonal ritual.

He wasn't acting. And why should he? Folks young and old from all parts of Michigan know Reaves as the real Father Christmas. And this year the Jaycees have named him senior citizen of the year for Michi-

gan.
"Old St. Nicholas is still going strong," he said even though a bleeding ulcer and other ailments have slowed him down.

"But I have a lot of understudies," Reaves said in between laughs.

And as in so many years gone by, Santa Reaves has touched the hearts of Canton residents. In return this year the chamber has adopted his 'Santa's Christmas Fund" program.

Guests to the chamber's annual holiday party, 7-10 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 12, at the Sunflower Village Hanford Club House, 45800 Hanford Road, are asked to bring sweaters, caps, mittens, stuffed animals, money and other donations for the fund.

Reaves then promises to distribute his goodies to Bryant School for the Retarded, Dorsey Street Community Center, Foster Grandparent Association, respite centers and area group



Senate OKs county stadium tax ballot request

By Tim Richard staff writer

Wayne County barely won authority to ask voters March 17 for a package of taxes to help finance a new Detroit Tigers stadium

Senators Thursday almost knocked the wheels off County Executive Ed McNamara's buggy by voting 18-14 in favor of an entirely different set of taxes from those McNamara sought. But the amendment failed because 20 votes were

"We seem to have some momen-Michael Duggan, the McNamara deputy who has guided the stadium project, told reporters after the all-day session. "We're going to sit down with the Tigers in January and make them an offer. We're gonna need a deal."

The lack of a deal - a firm promise by Tigers owner Tom Monaghan to stay in Detroit and occupy a new downtown stadium was used by opponents to attack House Bill 5300.

THE SENATE gave 22-9 support to the measure empowering Wayne County commissioners to ask voters for a countywide 1 percent tax on

restaurant food and beverages, 2 percent on rental cars and 1 percent on hotels and motels.

They expanded the bill to allow Oakland, Washtenaw, Ingham, Kent and Muskegon counties to finance stadiums, too. The bill must go back to the House for concurrence.

The buggy wheels almost came off a second time when the Senate needed three roll calls to obtain a twothirds majority (26) to give the bill immediate effect. Without it, the measure wouldn't become law until the end of March, two weeks after the planned election date.

Here's how area senators voted on final passage:

• Yes - Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion, Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, Robert Geake, R-Northville, George Z. Hart, D-Dearborn.

• No - Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham - "with reluctance. I see constitutional problems" with the new taxes exceeding the 4 percent limit on the sales and use tax in the Michigan Constitution. "I don't see any correlation between the taxes and the benefits. You may eat at Eight Mile and Greenfield and yet subsidize the stadium." But Bouchard switched on the immediate effect provision and supported it.

Canton Township police are asking for help in finding a box containing 100 to 200 hypodermic needles that possibly were used on aids virus pa-

The needles were stolen sometime Saturday night from the unlocked car of a 35-year-old Canton woman, who works for a Plymouth pharmaceutical company, Canton police officer Jerry Ellerholz said Sunday. The woman reported the missing needles shortly before 8:30 a.m. Sunday after discovering the theft from her car at the Crossings of Canton apartment complex at Joy and and the I-275 freeway, where she lives,

The used needles were in a 10inch, yellow box with a red top and is labled with the words "bio-hazardous waste," Ellerholz said. He did not identify the Plymouth pharmaceutical company, where the woman is employed.

"The needles may have been used on HIV positive patients and we want to make sure they don't fall into the hands of kids," he said. "We don't know why she had the needles."

Anyone who has any information about the box or the needles should call Canton police at 397-3000, Ellerholz said. The box containing the used was locked, but it is not a strong lock, he said.

Also stolen from the woman's car was a number of unused hypodermic needles and a black tackle box containing several prescription pills, Ellerholz said. But the tackle box and a number of prescription pills, identified as clozaril, were recovered on the bicycle path along the I-275 freeway, he said.

Some of the pills have not been found, but an inventory had not been completed Sunday afternoon and police did not know know many pills were still missing, Ellerholz said.







Canton bows to King in state semifinal

As bizarre as this girls basketball state tournament has been, it should come as no surprise to hear the losing coach in a lopsided game say his team played well, while the win-ning coach called his team's performance below standard.

Whatever the coaches' ratings, the result of Friday's Class A semifinal between Plymouth Canton and Detroit Martin Luther King provided a stark reminder why King is the defending Class A champion. The Crusaders gained control in the first quarter and never relinquished it, cruising to a 63-46 triumph at Battle Creek Central HS Friday.

Farmington Hills Mercy stopped Saginaw 47-44 in Friday's second semifinal but lost to the Crusaders 52-36 in the state championship game Saturday at Kellogg Arena in Battle Creek.

AS LATE as Friday afternoon, no one could be sure the games would be played. Parents of No. 1-ranked Detroit Murray-Wright got a court restraining order after their team was disqualified for using players not on their official tournament

Judge Kathleen MacDonald did not make her ruling on the case until after 4 p.m. Friday (the Canton-King game started at 5 p.m.). She upheld the Michigan High School Athletic Association's decision to disqualify Murray-Wright, which resulted in Mercy's getting a bye into the semi-

A bye may have been Canton's best hope for advancing past King. There was no blaming the Chiefs for lack of effort; as coach Bob Blohm said, "I'm not at all displeased with our intensity. The kids never stopped playing hard."

But .

It was really a game for only the first six minutes. Tiffany Mitchell scored inside for King to tie the game at 5-5 with 2:56 left in the first quarter, and that got the Crusaders, well, crusading. They outpointed Canton 10-3 in the final three minutes to take a 13-8 advantage into the second period.

IT NEVER improved for the Chiefs. With five minutes left in the second quarter, Britta Anderson scored Canton's third basket of the game. It didn't derail King; by the time the quarter was half over, the Crusaders had added a 10-4 spurt to their first-quarter run to go up 23-12.

Blohm had already called two timeouts in that span. He was left to plead with his team to try to keep it close - maybe they can turn it around in the second half.

The Chiefs never got the chance. King has size, and plenty of it. Its inside game was nearly unstoppable; at times, Canton had three defenders

trying to check one Crusader inside, and they couldn't do it.

With 2:40 left in the half, one of those giants - 5-foot-10 sophomore Shawnte Gates - powered inside and scored, and was fouled by Amy Westerhold. Gates finished off the three-point play, increasing King's lead to 30-17.

The Crusaders added six more to their total by the intermission without surrendering a point, making it 36-17 at the half. Mitchell, who finished with a game-high 22 points, got 10 of them in the second quarter

"KING IS big, and they're mobile," said Blohm. "We worked really hard, but they move up the floor really fast.

"I thought we could have defended a little better and taken away their second shot. We could have been better at stopping the ball going inside, getting help inside, and then rebounding the ball. But (King) does a lot of tough things.'

Like defense. "Their pressure . their quickness makes it hard to receive the ball. It wears on you, makes you work for everything. Over 32 minutes, that takes its toll," Blohm said.

Canton's inside threat, 6-foot junior center Stephanie Gray, shook loose in the third quarter to score six points; she was held to four in the first half. Still, Canton was outscored in the period, 12-8, and trailed 48-25 entering the last eight minutes.

Plymouth Canton went the farthest of any Observerland team in the boys basketball tournament last year, becoming the first in school history to play in a regional final.

With eight players returning from that team, the Chiefs have the talent to be successful again and contend for the Western Lakes Activities Association championship.

But Canton will have to get through the first month without one of its top players - 6-foot-8, 260pound senior Tony Coshatt, who suffered a broken wrist when he fell during practice. He will miss all of December.

"I think he's frustrated," Canton coach Dave Van Wagoner said, "but we'll just be that much stronger when we get him back. The league season doesn't start until the middle

"The first six non-conference games are real tough. We'll just have to buckle our seat belts and go with what we have.'

WHAT THE Chiefs, who were 17-8 and upset heavily favored Plymouth Salem to win a district title, have is a quality team even with Coshatt on the sideline.

Canton still has plenty of height and possibly the best group of shooting guards in western Wayne County. Senior Derrick McDonald (6-1), jun-

ior Mike Stafford (6-1) and senior Jon Paupore (6-0) will generate much of the offense from the back

McDonald, an All-Observer player, averaged 16 points and six assists, as well as six rebounds. He took his game a notch higher late in the season when he averaged 20 points in the last 10. Paupore averaged 10 points and Stafford eight.

"I feel we have three of the best outside shooters I've coached," Van Wagoner said. "They're all on the same team so that makes it nice. It will make it hard for teams to zone us, because those guys can really fill it up.

In addition, Canton has a pair of high-scoring players from a 14-6 junior varsity team. Sophomore Matt Paupore averaged 20 points and junior Brad Paskievitch 17. Both are big guards as each stands 6-2.

"This is the best shooting team I've ever coached, and it has the potential to be the best offensive team," said Van Wagoner, who has moved Stafford to point guard, a position shared by McDonald and Karl Wukie last year.

"MIKE IS probably our best passer, and he can shoot the ball, which is a deadly combination," Van Wagoner said. "If people lay off him, he can stick the outside shot. If they get right in his face, he's going to





New spin for music Magazine lets the artists do the talking

Cynicism may be viewed as the bane of all artistic expression and, darn, if Dan Santoni allows such skepticism to seep into his new publication, 78 RPM.

Geez, that's no fun. The magazine debuts this monthand will provide a forum for all types of artists to articulate a viewpoint of their work and on the arts in general. No thumbs up or thumbs down, no star or rose ratings - just the words from the artists

themselves "For one, I'm an artist myself. I know what it is like to put your artwork into a show or a band dealing with club owners," said Santoni, 21, who is a photographer. "I want to give the artist an opportunity to speak freely for themselves instead of someone else doing it for them."

In a prototype issue, 78 RPM features interviews with a person who makes jewelry out of recyclable materials, an avant-garde photographer as well as local musicians Brothers from Another Planet and national music sensation Fishbone. The articles are either in-depth autobiographical pieces or a Q&A format.

THOUGH SUCH articles would seem cursory and a one-sided exercise of ego, Santoni said the magazine's mission is to delve deeper into motivations and psyche of the artist. Too often, he feels, those interpretations are left to outsiders who can only surmise to what threshold a person seeks to achieve with his craft.

What may separate 78 RPM from other art publications could be the artists themselves.

Instead of covering trendy designers and pop art, Santoni sees his task as bringing to the surface those artists submerged in their own obscurity. The publication will be highly visual, relying on artists for its attitude rather than its

At least that was the initial source of inspiration for Santoni. The idea for an arts magazine developed a year ago through a conversation among co-workers in the Sam's Jams parking lot in Ferndale where he worked.

The discussion centered on the history of Detroit music. More precisely, the emergence of such innovators as Iggy and the Stooges and the MC 5 and how their influences still permeate music today.

'We were wondering what's around now that's like that," Santoni said.

GOOD QUESTION, and the answer usually takes a considerable amount of research and commitment. The group decided to pool their resources; several are writers and photographers themselves.

But several meetings in the planning stages digressed into what Santoni described as "a real mess" with 14 people voicing varying opinions on what direction the publication should take.

Others began to fall off. Finally, Santoni and a few others carried on with their original

In December, the 38-page publication will debut on newsstands and through mail subscriptions. The price is tentatively set at \$2.50 a copy.

A benefit, "Mural of Reality: An Establishing of New Foundations," Nov. 5 at Industry in Pontiac raised an estimate \$1,100 for 78 RPM. The start-up costs have been offset through contributions and \$1,500 out of Santoni's own pocket.

"We're trying to fill a new niche, especially in Detroit," Santoni said. "It might be a risk, but I feel it's worth doing."

Well, it's about time. Sparks, one of the best and brightest bands of the '70s (their best period) who still had more than a few bright spots during the '80s and may surprise us all in the '90s, have released this double retrospective of their brilliant career as rock's "weird guys."

First, there was Ron Mael, the group's songwriter and keyboard player, with a penchant for playing in his minimalist style as his brother (and resident heartthrob) Russell danced around, singing in his falsetto voice, which often disguised the fact that, hey, these guys are writing some of the smartest, cleverest lyrics around, bar none

Even today, songs such as "Hasta Manana," "Monsieur" and "Achoo" easily stand up. Did I fail to mention they wrapped those lyrics around some of the catchiest rock of the era? If so, take it from me: they did. And it still holds up extremely well.

The L.A.-based band had to go to

for the Two of Us" and "Something for the Girl with Everything" and many, many more, including their biggest U.S. hit, "Cool Places," sung with Sparks fan extraordinaire and Go-Go Jane Wiedlin.

In fact, my only complaint with this double-set is that it leans too much on the band's later work and not enough on their earlier stuff. For example, I would have loved to hear 'Whippings and Apologies" or the hilarious "BC."

The CD has 40 cuts, seven more than the tape, including rare B-sides like "Barbecute" and "Lost and Found." The tape includes some unreleased gems too, though, such as the original version on "I Like Girls," which was virtually destroyed with over-production on the

"Big Beat" album. Sparks may be an acquired taste, but it's one far more worthwhile than sushi and dark beer, as far as I'm concerned.

Eclectic? Undoubtedly. Essential? Surely, Rocking? One listen and you'll never have to ask again. Highly recommended.

If all of this sounds more than a little timely, it should. The latest and (if you can trust the advertising) last episode in the popular "Star Trek" film series wears its political correctness on its sleeve. It reflects 1990s sensibilities in the same way the original series tackled war, racism and the youth movement during the turbulent 1960s.

It's no secret that the warrior race of Klingons introduced in the "Star Trek" series were actually thinly disguised Soviets. Peace, after all, had already been established on earth, where young Ensign Pavol Chekhov could now join the diverse ethnic and racial mix aboard the Enterprise crew.

From the "Evil Empire" vantage point of the 1980s, when "Star Trek" arrived on the movie screen, the Klingons were as ugly as they were

mean. They even caused the death of Captain Kirk's only son. It's at this point that Kirk and the rest of the original crew are volunteered to escort the Klingon high command to an interplanetary peace conference.

THE IDEA of making peace is not a happy one for Federation veterans like Kirk or his Klingon counter-

"In space, the only war is a cold war," says Chang, the Shakespeareloving Klingon commander. Kirk must face his prejudices against a planet of people he genu-

inely feels can never be trusted. Fortunately, "Star Trek VI," sub-titled "The Undiscovered Country," is only partly about politics. It's also an action film, and though it doesn't exactly move at warp speed, it keeps interest up through an intelligently reached conclu

For once, we are spared lengthy introductions to the familiar characters, reprised once more by William Shatner, DeForest Kelly and Leonard Nimoy. Within five minutes, they have been briefed and sent on their way, hurtling through space to meet up with the Klingo

WHILE CAPTAIN Kirk finds the obligatory love interest with a sexy alien, the usual cornball humor is kept to a minimum. In one of the film's few comic asides, the ever cranky Dr. McCoy laments that Kirk always gets the girls.

It's no accident that the film is so good. Nicholas Meyer, the talented director and screenwriter, was responsible for the best film in the series, "Star Trek II: The Wrath of Khan." He knows how to generate suspense from what can easily become a boring formula.

Will this really be the last "Star Trek" film? Yes and no, according to the film's conclusion. The original crew of the Enterprise appears ready to lay down alongside Gene Roddenberry, the characters' creator who died this fall.

If there is another film, Captain Sulu (George Takei), who has spent the last 25 years taking orders, may finally get his chance to take com-

Stray Dog: Thriller sans violence

Looking very dapper in his crisp white suit, the police detective leaves the gun range and gets on the trolley car.

Packed cheek-to-jowl with other passengers, the detective soon loses his coolness in the oppressive heat. As the other riders jostle around to make their stop, the detective realizes that his pocket has been picked and his gun is missing.

That incident starts the young detective, played by Toshiro Mifune, on a long journey through the slightly seedy, desperate and outright criminal parts of society to retrieve his weapon in Akira Kurosawa's 1949 film "Stray Dog," currently available on video After losing the thief in a foot pur-


suit, the detective returns dejectedly to the police station to receive the punishment or firing he expects over the loss of his weapon. "This isn't the army," an older of-

ficer tells him as he sends Mifune, a homicide investigator, over to the division that handles pickpockets to start his search. There is a nice montage sequence

as Mifune, dressed in ratty clothes and a cap, moves through the streets looking for a dealers in hot guns. His eyes never rest, moving over the hurrying crowds and homeless people sleeping in streets and alleys.

THE EARNEST young detective's worst fears come true when he learns his gun has been used in a crime. The detective is increasingly panicked by thoughts of being responsible, by losing his weapon, for further damage.

Mifune is very good as the detective, his desperation barely under



control and combining with his inexperience to cause some errors.

A veteran officer, played by Takashi Shimura, joins the search and clearly knows more about a criminal investigation than the younger man. The pair are able to track down their man but not without personal costs.

"Stray Dog" - the title comes from comment by the older officer about their suspect - is a wellpaced tense detective drama. But it's probably not what you'd expect from that description. There are no car chases, the officers walk or take the street car, and there is very little violence or gunplay.

The story moves through the characters and the unfolding investigation. Kurosawa assumes the audience is intelligent enough to follow the story as it proceeds without stereotypical action film devices.

The film also looks at broader issues, some that would have been particularly relevant in Japan during the years immediately following the Second World War. The man the officers are seeking turns out to be a

veteran who has had trouble adjusting to civilian life. The detective sympathizes with the veterans.

"I SAW men go bad very quickly during the war," he comments. Well played by Shimura, the older officer doesn't agree. He isn't concerned about why criminals break the law. He is there to protect the real victims, those whose suffering is caused by criminals.

Very subtly, Kurosawa provides comments and glimpses of post-war Japanese society that has been disrupted and altered forever. Learning that a female pickpocket has given up her trademark kimono for a dress and hair permanent, Shimura says, 'Times do change.'

I was fascinated by even the visual subtext of Japanese life of the era shown from a Japanese perspective.

Give the gift of free flights to the needy

While you are thinking about Christmas giving, you might contribute your Continental Airlines frequent flier miles to CAREFORCE, an organization founded by Continental employees to help people in a fransportation crisis.

The Freedom Passport, usually available only to passengers 62 years old or more, can be bought until Jan. 16, 1992, by anyone 55 years old or older. The \$1,799 passport is good for one year in the 48 contiguous states as well as Canada, St. Thomas and St. Croix.

You can make a maximum of one one-way trip per week if you stay over a Saturday night, with a few blackout dates during special holidays.

Practically speaking, this gives you about 23 flights a year at \$78 a flight. The only other costs might be the \$6 U.S. departure tax to Canada or the Caribbean.

Continental flies to most states. It doesn't fly to Tennessee and has limited service to states like North and South Carolina and West Virginia.

If you are 62 or over, you can buy this passport anytime. The special promotion for those 55 and over is available only through Jan. 15, 1992. If your application is postmarked before Dec. 16, 1991, you get an additional month

on your ticket.
Call toll free (800) 441-1135.
While you're at it, ask about the Global Passport. They won't mention it unless you ask, but it is also available to the 55-and-up crowd for the same dates.

That passport costs \$3,599.

tlanta, the south's largest city, has all the razzle-dazzle of an American metropolis: a glittering skyline, a wide choice of glitzy hotels, shops and restaurants, a tempting array of shows, exhibits and nightlife and attractions that range from Atlanta Underground to the World of Coca-Cola.

The city seems to be on a roll. After the drama of seeing the Braves in the World Series, Atlanta is looking forward to the 1994 Super Bowl and the 1996 Olympics. Excitement is in the air.

But another Atlanta still exists in the side streets; a traditional soft-spoken, slow-paced, friendly southern town.

One way to enjoy that ambiance is to stay at the Shellmont Bed and Breakfast house, built in 1891 with many fine architectural details, located in a quiet residential neighborhood within walking distance of downtown Atlanta. The main house has 20 rooms, all with private bath.

THE SHELLMONT'S carriage house, a small building in the back of the property, is a real find for travelers who like a home-away-from-home feeling. There's a living room, kitchen, bedroom and bath and a little porch overlooking a charming garden, as well as a hammock, a small pond stocked with goldfish and a resident cat, (\$90 a night for two people; continental breakfast included).

Piedmont Park is within walking distance, at Piedmont and 14th Street, with jogging trails and tennis courts. (Even in winter, Atlanta has many mild days.) There's also a spectacular Botanical Gardens, 60 acres in all, with a large conservatory full of tropical plants and during the Christmas season, poinsettias, and a 15-acre hardwood forest. It's a wonderful big-city oasis.

Coca-Cola and Cable News Network are two of Atlanta's most famous products: they're now decorated for Christmas and offering special events as well as their popular tours. CNN is in the Omni Complex at Marietta Street and Techwood Drive Reservations are available only on the day of the tour, tickets cost \$5 and Saturday tours fill up fast.

CNN Center's fifth annual Tuba Christmas brings 100 tuba players from around the country to play Christmas music from noon to 2 p.m. Dec. 20. If you are a tuba player, you can register on the day of the event.

The World of Coca-Cola is next to Underground Atlanta at 55 Mar-

Located in Midtown, Piedmont Park is the site of the Arts Festival of Atlanta, concerts and other special events. The

tin Luther King Drive; tour tickets cost \$2.50 and reservations can be made ahead. See their spectacular international Christmas Tree and a Christmas exhibit featuring the artwork of Haddon Sundblom, who created the image of Santa Claus as we know it today.

ATLANTA'S ANNUAL Festival of Trees will be at the Georgia World Congress Center, 285 International Blvd., through Dec. 15, and has Christmas trees and wreaths decorated by the region's top designers, a children's corner with hands-on activities, a ginger-bread village, continuous performances and a carousel.

The striking High Museum, at 133 Peachtree St. downtown, creates a quiet, contemplative world of its own with art collections and special exhibits. But even here there's a holiday mood, with an Hispanic Fiesta featuring music and dance on Dec. 17 at 12:15 p.m.

As big cities go, Atlanta is easy to get around in, thanks to the rapid rail and bus system known as MARTA. (15 minute rail service to the airport costs. \$1.) Now the New Georgia Railroad is offering holiday rides, with carolling groups on board, for the Atlanta Loop and the Stone Mountain Loop on Dec. 14 and 21. These rides depart twice daily from the Milepost Station near Underground Atlanta; call (404) 656-0769 for times and reservations.

Underground Atlanta will, of course, be alive with lights, decorations, community choirs, street performers, storytellers and costumed characters — everything but snow and ice, which isn't traditional during the Christmas season in Atlanta, anyway. Look for the Great Tree

WE WERE to board the train to Chicago in Ann Arbor, a pleasant and easy drive from our home in Holly. I knew right away that traveling by train with my son would be a definite improvement.

While waiting on the platform for our train to arrive, people were introducing themselves and sharing "why we're going to Chicago" stories. Some even made plans to sit together during the trip to play cards

or just chat.

We boarded the train and sat in nice roomy seats where Sean could stretch out, unconfined by a car seat. The gentle rocking of the train lulled him to sleep several times during the trip. While he slept, nice people in our car offered to buy me sodas and

snacks on their trips to the club car.
When awake, Sean was happier
and more relaxed, and had my complete undivided attention. He took

great pride in sitting in his seat and eating snacks from the pull-down tray-table like a "big boy." He very much enjoyed gazing out of the train windows and taking occasional walks through other cars.

Because I'm a new first-time mother, one concern I did have on this trip was the possibility of "child-snatching." I recalled that there was quite a long, underground walk from the tracks to Union Station upon arrival in Chicago.

IN ADDITION, my parents had warned that because of construction on several major Chicago highways leading to Union Station, they might be delayed in picking us up.

With this in mind, I bought a 3-foot, heavy-duty, chain-linked dog leash before leaving on our trip. Once we arrived in Chicago, I put my hand through the sturdy leather handle of the leash, slid it up my arm inside my jacket and secured it tightly around my upper arm.

The other end of the leash was clipped onto the clasps of my son's overall jeans, inside his jacket. Although I did receive a few odd looks, I took comfort in the fact that if someone were to grab my son, they were going to have to take me too.

Future fees on banks would supply up to \$30 billion of the capital. The FDIC would borrow the remainder from the Treasury, using seized bank assets as collateral. Taxpayers would stand behind both mechanisms. The bill also steps up FDIC examinations of bank books, and makes the deposit insurance fund more secure against risky banking

A yes vote was to pass the FDIC

recapitalization bill. Michigan representatives voting yes were Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, William Ford, D-Taylor, Sander Levin, D-Southfield and William Broomfield, R-Birmingham.

FEDERAL DEPOSIT INSUR-ANCE - By a vote of 74 for and 355 against, the House rebuffed an attempt to limit federal deposit insurance to \$100,000 per person per bank, plus \$100,000 for an IRA. The vote occurred during debate on HR 3768 (above).

Sponsor Richard Armey, R-Texas, said his intent was "to limit taxpayer exposure to any potential repeat of the savings and loan debacle in banking."

Opponent Carroll Hubbard, D-Ky., said the proposal would alarm consumers and cause capital flight from small-town banks.

This occurred before the Senate passed, on a non-record vote, a bill providing \$70 billion in new capital for the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (S 543).

BROKERED DEPOSITS - By a vote of 64 for and 32 against, the Senate rejected an amendment to prohibit federal deposit insurance from covering "brokered deposits" in banks. Such risk-free investments are packaged by securities brokers and sent nationwide in search of the highest rates. The amendment was offered to the FDIC bill (above). Mindful of how brokered deposits fueled the S & L collapse, the bill re-

stricts them to strong banks. Jake Garn, R-Utah, called the amendment unnecessary because the bill already guards against abuses from brokered deposits.

Sponsor Bob Graham, D-Fla., said "the U.S. taxpayers should not be putting their subsidized deposit insurance behind those accounts."

A yes vote supported federal deposit insurance for brokered deposits in strong banks.

Sen. Levin voted no. Sen. Riegle voted yes.





Y UNIQUE ability to procrastinate will again this year have me finishing my holiday baking sometime by New Year's Eve. There's little doubt that I will once again be forced to chill my dough for an hour in the freezer rather than allowing it to mellow and harden normally for a few hours in the refrigerator.

I WILL again break my vow of not shopping after midnight trying to find an all-night grocery in search of sugar, red and green sprinkles and butter-flavored Crisco, knowing darned well I should have had enough on hand before I even started.

But people like Ursula Rymarz of Livonia, and Yvonne Christensen of Farmington Hills certainly influence me with a continuing reminder that there is hope for us cutting-edge trendoids.

Rymarz, the mother of three grown children, calls herself "basically an old-fashioned, down-toearth gal" who eschews the virtues of newfangled air-cushioned cookie



sheets and parchment paper.

She still uses old cookie sheets handed down from her mother, and wasn't the least bit interested in learning more about parchment pa-

She has always looked upon her holiday baking chores as a tradition more than a job, and has been doing so for more than 28 years. This year,

as in the past, she and her daughter Michele, 22, will have made 12 different types of Christmas cookies, ending up with "about 25 dozen or so,

depending on how many they taste."
Christensen will also have her holiday cookies baked, packaged and secured in addition to sewing holiday costumes for kids Katie and Heather for a holiday pageant. With a little

help from husband Claude, and even 8-month-old Corey getting into the spirit, the family will gather for an evening of cookie baking and deco-

rating.

'Christensen claims that several years ago, she went out and bought some "fancy-shmansy" cookie cutters, only to fall back on the old faithful inexpensive tin ones after

being disappointed.


Not even knowing the benefits of air-cushioned cookie sheets or parchment, this holiday baker will again rely solely on her "Baker's Secret" cookie sheets and 39 cent tin cookie cutters.

I KNOW I rely far too much on trendy gadgets and goodies that make life in the kitchen a little easier, but for folks like Ursula Rymarz and Yvonne Christensen who have yet to discover the joys of baking cookies on parchment paper, once you try it, you'll never want to grease another pan.

Parchment paper that can be reused not only makes clean-up a breeze but it literally enables the cookies to slide off the sheet.

Here are two examples of modern-day women who have little or no need for the "trendy" equipment that modern-day cooks need. They might not have air-cushioned cookie sheets and fancy cookie guns, but the final product emerging from the oven shows that with a mixer, a bowl and a few spoons, "nothin' says lovin' like somethin' from the oven"!

Smart cookies share secrets

"A home with cookies baking in the oven is a home filled with love and happiness," said Rose Levy Beranbaum, author of "Rose's Christmas Cookies," (William Morrow, Inc. \$23).

Here are some of Beranbaum's tips for perfect cookies.

To cream butter, begin with room-temperature butter, or use refrigerated butter cut into squares. Beat until light and fluffy.

Choose flat baking sheets with very low edges so the air can circulate over and around cookies during baking.

Preheat the oven for at least 15 minutes prior to bak-

ing. Double-check the oven temperature with a ther-

mometer that rests on the center rack in the oven.

Arrange baking sheets in the oven at least 2 inches apart so the hot air can circulate freely around each sheet. If the oven does not accommodate two sheets, bake only one batch at a time. Rearrange and rotate cookie sheets halfway through baking time to ensure

even browning.

Do not store soft cookies and crisp cookies together; the soft cookies will cause the crisp cookies to soften.

Use a separate container to store each variety of cookie to preserve its special flavor.

For the holiday baker looking for timeless holiday baking tips, Yvonne Christensen recommends:

 Bake one sheet of cookies at a time on the center rack of a preheated oven. Check at the end of the minimum baking time — a minute can make a heck of a lot of difference.

Unless recipe states otherwise, remove immediately from the cookie sheet with a spatula to a wire rack to cool.

 Place a slice of bread in cookie tins for storage to keep cookies from drying out and getting too hard.

Place a pan of water in the oven while baking cookies and other holiday baked goods. The humidity keeps the baked goods from rising too high in the center.





Wines from Alsace region age well

region in France. Almost isolated, Alsace is situated between the Vosges Mountains on the west and the Rhine river on the east.

The best-kept secret in wine is the dry, fruity, long-lived white wines of Alsace. They accompany the great cuisine of 36 Michelin-starred restaurants in Alsace - a greater number than anywhere else in Europe.

RECENTLY, WE discussed Alsace wine with Etienne Hugel, whose family has made wine continuously since 1639.

We have produced Alsace wines in Europe's favorite battlefield for over 350 years," said Hugel. "Imagine our task. Each time the Alsace region exchanged its relationship with Germany and France, we had

"As a consequence of having our boundaries changed so often, the wines of Alsace lost their identity. We sell dry, French wines in a Ger-man-style bottle made from grapes that sometimes sound French (pinot blanc) and sometimes sound German (gewurztraminer)."

Most French wine regions use two or three grape varieties planted on a single soil type. Gewurztraminer has lively spice aromas and flavors that complement smoked salmon and oriental cuisines. Ultimately, people should enjoy the elegant balance and finesse of riesling, the king of Alsace varietals"

Hugel insists that the key to producing fresh, balanced Alsace wines is the long, cool growing season. Grapes can hang on the vine until biological maturity is attained. This slow ripening explains how Alsace

wines maintain crisp acidity, retain fresh fruit and achieve the body of world-class wine.

The wines of Hugel are bottled by increasing quality and labeled "Hugel," "Cuvee Tradition" and "Jubilee." The day-to-day process of

vinification and maturation is undertaken entirely by family members. Contrary to popular opinion, the aging potential of the great Alsace white wines is limited only by the lifespan of the cork.

"All great wines have the potential to improve with extended bottle age," contends Hugel. "Alsace white wines age as well as the great red wines of Bordeaux. For example, a bottle of 1865 Hugel Tokay Pinot Gris, recorked in 1922 and tasted in 1983, was described by international wine authority Michael Broadbent as 'quite unbelievably perfect."

"Detroit: Santa Isn't Coming to Town???", a locally produced half-hour Christmas special featuring Detroit-area celebrities, airs Monday, December 16, at 8 p.m. on WJBK-TV 2.

The story unfolds when Santa Claus, played by WOMC-FM morning personality Tom Ryan, announces that he is skipping this year's Detroit Thanksgiving Parade due to a severe economic crunch at the North Pole. Instead, Santa has accepted an offer of "a million billion dollars" to appear in a Thanksgiving Parade in a foreign country.

Stunned city officials begin interviewing possible replacements for Santa, including a deadpan Maurice "Mr. Belvedere" Lezell practicing his best "ho, ho, ho." In the meantime, four local children take matters into their own hands, inviting Santa to come to Detroit on a fact-finding mission with hopes of changing his mind.

The kids escort Santa around town, showing him such highlights as Belle Isle and taking him to see local celebrities who try to convince him to appear in the Detroit parade. The final stop on the tour is a visit to the home of Santa's favorite baseball announcer Emie Harwell for a last-ditch pitch.

As Santa struggles with the dilemma of disappointing the children of Detroit or taking the million billion dollars, he is reminded by one of the kids that Christmas is about giving, not getting. The story concludes with TV news coverage of the Detroit Thanksgiving Parade, revealing the outcome of Santa's decision.

"Detroit: Santa Isn't Coming to Town???" was written and produced by Tom Delisle and shot at locations in and around Detroit by TV 2 photographer Bob Berg.

fields. For this show, I wanted to have a child, because my dad works particularly well with children, and also because it's Christmas. So I said to myself, 'Who's the biggest child star around?' and Macauley Culkin of course comes to mind.'

Typical of Hope guests, Culkin was eager to accept the invitation, but already rather busy with other commitments. Still, Hope is Hope, and a deal was struck with 20th Century Fox to spring the child actor from the set of "Home Alone 2" for a couple of days to do the Christmas show

A few more phone calls and country music's Reba McEntire and Carolyn Sapp, Miss America 1992 ("My dad worked with her for a charity show in Florida about two months ago and thought she was a very talented young woman, and said. 'Let's see if we can get her for the Christmas show.") were added to the roster for a show taped between Dec. 7 and 15 in Colorado Springs, Colo., the site of the U.S. Air Force Academy, and Nashville,

Also featured this year is a tribute to comedian Redd Foxx (" because my dad loved Redd Foxx. and Redd went with him on a couple of those overseas Christmas tours") that includes a memorable sketch from the 1972 Christmas show that saw Foxx playing Santa.

An annual highlight is the singing of "Silver Bells," a latter-day holiday standard Hope introduced in the 1951 movie "The Lemon Drop Kid "He's included it as a duet in 15 shows, and this year asked that wife Dolores, whose singing voice still earns well-justified praise, join him on the stage

Because taping of the show would be completed just three days before its scheduled air date, with guests (including the Associated Press All American college football team) flying in from all over, producer Linda Hope has developed some contingency plans, but she says her father usually gets what he needs for a show - from guests to weather.

"My father has been really amazing with the weather." she recalls. "Last Christmas we were in Bermuda, and we were out on a beach doing a sketch which was the final piece of the show. All of a sudden, the rain came up. But we had everything set up, so we went ahead and did the thing, and we were just going to do it one more time to take off any rough edges, and we got through three quarters of it and it started raining, so we at least had everything in the can, as they say.

Although showman Hope has been heard to say that he puts himself in his daughter's hands during production of the television specials, she insists with a laugh that "he's being very kind, but he's the man who's been doing it all these years.

"I deal with the scheduling — the nuts and bolts part of it." She laughs again. "He's very cute to say that.

And now, for the fiftieth year and counting, on with the show
