## Rouge runs clean, fishery could fly

For the first time in recent memory, a river once considered among the most polluted in the Midwest will be home to brown trout — a fish that requires extremely clean water to survive.

That is if all goes as planned by Bob Laich and his cohorts at Plymouth Township's Western Wayne County Conservation Association and the state Department of Natural Resources.

Seven years ago, about the time the Friends of the Rouge initiated its annual "Clean the Rouge" day, Laich seized the opportunity to work on the WWCCA's section of the river, a tributary that flows through Salem,

Northville and Plymouth townships. Known as Johnson Creek or the Johnson Drain, the tributary flows through a beautiful wooded area

that's home to wild turkeys, white-tailed deer, snapping turtles, opossums, raccoons, and enough birds to go through 1,500 pounds of bird seed furnished each winter by the WWCCA.

"MY DREAM WAS to make this into a viable trout fishery in Wayne County," said Westland's Laich, who is vice president of the Michigan United Conservation Club and a past WWCCA president.

It was an uphill battle. Unfortunately, many used the river as a junkyard. It was so far gone that people who heard about Laich's idea thought he was dreaming.

"When Bob started this six or seven years ago, I thought he was crazy," said longtime WWCCA member John Goulet. "That stream has a reputation of being as polluted as any of them."

It didn't dissuade the retired La-

## Bank robber escapes; police hunt continues

Bandit pulls  
first heist  
since '67

The first bank robbery in the city of Plymouth since 1967 was reported Friday.

At 12:05 p.m., a man approached a teller at the Heritage Federal Savings Bank, 650 S. Main, demanding cash.

"He approached the teller with a note," said Plymouth Police Chief Robert Scoggins.

"The handle of a gun was seen in the man's waistband," he said, adding the gun had white tape on the handle.

"The employees observed the

gun," said FBI spokesman John Anthony.

Upon leaving the bank with an undisclosed amount of cash, the thief ran south on Main past Prudential

Realtors, 670 S. Main, and through a parking lot toward Linden Street.

"He got into a vehicle on Linden,"

## Ice time Chill puts thrill in ice festival

Near-zero weekend temperatures brought out the biggest crowds in recent years to Plymouth's 10th annual International Ice Sculpture Spectacular.

Because warm weather plagued recent festivals — and the Persian Gulf War overshadowed last year's fest — some were wondering if Plymouth's most notable public event would continue.

But those fears were put to rest this year, as an old-fashioned Michigan winter descended upon the Detroit area just in time for the 1992 ice fest.

"The restaurants were jammed last night. We had a lot of families and children," said a smiling Mike Watts, ice festival director, on Saturday.

"They're really happy with it. Gee it's cold," he added.

"WE HAVE BEEN wanting to

come," said Julie Gephart of Dundee, Mich., viewing sculptures in Kellogg Park with her mother, Anne Johnson, and her children, Jill and Justin.

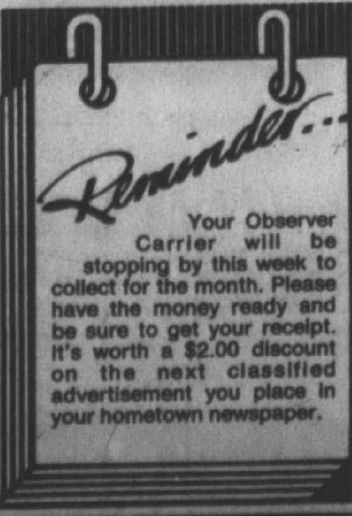
While they didn't come last year, when warm temperatures melted sculptures and hurt the festival, Gephart said the cold weather encouraged them to make their first trip to Plymouth.

Here's an idea that could boost sagging business and create a little fun in downtown Plymouth.

Outdoor street cafes could help draw folks downtown, say some Downtown Development Authority members who want to encourage the idea. "They would have a real positive impact on the traffic downtown, it could help keep people there at night," said DDA chairman Lee Harrison.

His comment followed the Jan. 9 DDA meeting, where members reviewed a plan from Penniman Deli owner Russ Webster.

IT CALLS FOR a 26-foot wooden deck opposite his restaurant, on the other side of the sidewalk. It would extend seven feet past the existing curb into Penniman Street.

Harrison said DDA members "are really in fa-

vor of these kinds of things, we encouraged that." "We under-utilize the outdoor cafe concept in Plymouth," said DDA member and former Mayor David Pugh.

Pugh said he suggested the idea to Webster, after spotting a deli with outdoor cafe in Dearborn.

"His only concern was would the city allow him to do that," Pugh recalled.

The DDA asked to review the Penniman Deli plan, which has to go to the planning commission for approval.

Webster said he hoped to get approval next month, and build the deck "hopefully by the end of March."

"To us, it seemed like a great idea. This shows what can be done with a little creativity," Pugh said. "We hope it sparks a little more excitement."

"Restaurants are one of the things that attract

people downtown," said City Manager Steve Walters. He said outdoor cafes at Northville restaurants — he used to be city manager there — sparked activity.

On street cafes, "Now would be the time to get some input into a streetscape design," Pugh said, allowing easy creation of such cafes once the planned streetscape renovation is complete.

Just down Penniman from the deli is Greg Goodman's Cafe Bon Homme, and Goodman said he's considered an outdoor cafe.

"I'm not wild about going out to the sidewalk," Goodman said, adding he's considered trying to buy the area between his restaurant and the post office. "I'd like to do it really nice, something like you might find in New Orleans," he said.

Restaurant owners could be encouraged that the city doesn't require additional parking to accommodate seasonal outdoor cafes.

## Cloverdale earns a clean bill of health

The new year has brought good news to Plymouth's Cloverdale Restaurant and Ice Cream Parlor, compliments of the Wayne County Health Department.

When John and Phyllis Kownacki bought the 60-year-old dairy at 447 Forest Ave. two years ago, they inherited an aging building with structural and cleaning problems. The health department withheld its food license pending recommended remodeling and improvements.

Based on her inspection at Cloverdale last month, public health sanitarian Nancy Gregor said she's recommending that the restaurant be relicensed. The paperwork should be completed and returned by the state health department so that by next month, Cloverdale will have its license in hand, she said.

"THEY'VE DONE quite a bit, and their sanitation has been very good,"

said Gregor. "A lot of their previous problems have been taken care of."

The owners have made changes to create more space for food preparation and storage, and installed a new ceiling, walls and floor to enhance cleanliness.

"They're maintaining everything in a sanitary manner and their equipment is being cleaned and maintained so that they're presenting no particular hazard. They've been doing a very nice job," said Gregor.

"I think they have come a long way. They're doing a very good job," said Dr. Val Vangieson, chief of code compliance for the health department. In its last inspection, Cloverdale received 87 points out of a possible 100, considered a good score, Vangieson said. A generally acceptable rating is 75-80 points.

Gregor said she expects Cloverdale will follow through with improvements now under way, such as adding a hand sink for employees, repainting shelving, and replacing

counter formica.

Phyllis Kownacki said Cloverdale has completed a number of major projects, including adding a party room for children's birthday parties and painting the outside of the building. A few large projects are on hold because of economics, she said.

"We're making sure everything is always proper and up to standard, as far as food quality, temperature and refrigeration are concerned," Kownacki said.

"The last thing we want to see is someone become ill. Cleanliness is number one."

"Areas where we lost some of our

points unfortunately come with problems associated with bad economic times," Kownacki said. "We haven't been able to do some of the changes we wanted to." Kownacki said she hopes Cloverdale, the Mayflower Hotel and the entire community will pull through the recession. The owners have no complaints with the health department, she added.

"I feel they are there to do a job service for the public. I certainly would not want to eat in a restaurant that wasn't up to standard. They're there to do the job that needs to be done to protect consumers. As a business owner, I want to be up to standard," Kownacki said. "We've enjoyed a good working relationship."

While some things have changed at Cloverdale, treasured traditions remain. One of them is the drive-up window, where Kownacki says you still can order anything from a gallon of milk to a double-dip chocolate ice cream cone or a lotto ticket.

## New district judgeship to gain city approval

The city of Plymouth is expected today to join the other four communities served by the 35th District Court in recommending approval of a third judgeship.

And the court building authority is scheduled Tuesday to review options for expanding the court building to accommodate a third judge.

District Judge James Garber said that when the state Legislature convenes later this month, "There will be a bill before them on a number of additional judgeships."

The state court administrator's office has recommended to the Legislature the creation of six additional district judgeships in the state for 1993, including one for the 35th District Court.

Court and local government officials seeking that third judgeship say they're hoping the Legislature will approve it by late April. That would allow time for candidates to file by a May deadline, and allow for scheduling of an August primary and November general election. This would allow the new judge

to start Jan. 1, 1993.

To make room for his or her honor, "It would take about six months to do any changes in the building," Garber said, "whether that's an addition to the south end or doing something within the four walls."

The five communities served by the court, on Plymouth Road, are Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Canton, Northville and Northville Township.

Court officials and court authority members say that because of the court's growing case load, creating a third judgeship is less expensive for taxpayers than a possible alternative — the state mandating that a third judge come in, at a cost borne 100 percent by local governments.

When the communities seek an additional judgeship, the judge's salary is paid mainly by the state.

So far, nearly \$400,000 in court proceeds normally returned to the five communities have been set aside for the renovation — probably enough to accomplish expansion, Garber said.

## DNR eyes Rouge as brown trout hatchery

ich, who grew accustomed to envisioning the future as an automotive design sculptor with Ford Motor Co.

"That was my goal. Seven years later, it's going to become a reality. I'm looking so forward to when I get the next phone call" from the DNR, informing the WWCCA that fingerlings actually will be stocked in the Johnson Drain, he said. "Then I'll know it's a reality. Since I got the first call, I've been walking high. It makes me feel so good," said Laich, who fished and swam in the Rouge as a kid growing up in Westland.

While the Clean Water Act of 1972 is responsible in many ways for the enhancement of water quality in southeastern Michigan, so is the elbow grease of Laich and WWCCA members. They've rolled up their sleeves and climbed into the river, hauling out everything from engine blocks to ice boxes.

"All of us got dirty, bit up, and what have you, but we kept at it

throughout the years," Laich said.

WHILE THERE'S PLENTY of credit to go around — including to folks like Plymouth Township officials Chuck Van Vleck, Esther Hulsing and Ron Griffith, Laich says stocking trout in the Rouge wouldn't be possible without Liz Hay.

Hay is a fisheries biologist with the DNR's Southeast Michigan District Field Office in Livonia.

"At the beginning, I could see the look of skepticism in her eyes," said Laich of Hay. Laich and Hay quickly saw eye-to-eye. To Laich's delight, Hay has worked diligently on the project for the past two years. Laich says you can work all you want independently cleaning a stream. But "if you don't find someone (in the DNR) who thinks like you do, it isn't going to fly. I give Liz a whole lot of credit for making this a reality."

Historical records on trout in Wayne County are tough to come by, and conventional wisdom varies. Some say this will mark the first

time in 40 years trout have thrived in this area. Others claim it'll be the first time ever.

Hay learned that "historically, Johnson Creek has been a brook trout stream. The first fish hatchery in the state was established in Northville in 1874 by Nelson Clark," she said.

"They used to have whitefish and brook trout. Both require cold water, and their water source was Johnson Creek, so there had to be good water quality. They had a very successful hatchery."

Hay said she looked at the stream to see if that type of condition still existed, despite all the urbanization which has gone on in Wayne County.

After monitoring the stream's temperature, oxygen levels, sediment load, and pollution levels for two years, Hay proposed that "we try and re-establish a fishery in there using brown trout. This tributary has clearly come back from a

state where it wasn't as good in the 1970's. It's come back much more now."

Hay said she's optimistic the DNR will approve her recommendation.

"I think the data supports putting trout in there," Hay has found in the Johnson Creek mayflies, caddisflies and stoneflies — all preferred trout foods — as well as blacknose dace and mottled sculpin, fish normally found in places inhabited by trout.

Plans call for five-inch fingerlings to be planted sometime in April, which means fishing by the summer of 1993. While the presence of two bubbling feeder streams and plans for enhancing the stream make spawning a good possibility, reproductivity will be in question for a while, says Hay.

There's a difference of opinion on whether the rule will be catch-and-release or catch-and-keep. Hay favors the former, Laich the latter.

Van Vleck, a WWCCA member

who works in emergency preparedness for Plymouth Township, says "I am really tickled with the news. What it tells me is how we've cleaned up the quality of the water."

Chairman of the WWCCA's Rouge clean-up team, Van Vleck for four years has donated old clothes and helped clear the river of refrigerators, tires, rusted car parts and tree cuttings on the Friends of the Rouge day in June, and on other occasions.

"We'll be back out there June 6 with our chain saws and sweat, making sure the river stays clean and running free," Van Vleck said.

Does all this mean the Rouge can come back?

"I think any river can heal itself," says Hay.

"Parts of the Main River and some of the tributaries are in good shape, and with the ongoing projects on the Rouge, a lot of money is being spent to try and correct the problems."

# Pro carvers chip away in contest

The temperature was zero, and the only creatures shunning long underwear were pigeons.

It was 9 a.m. Saturday, time for the professional ice carvers to hack and whack ice blocks into eagles, dancers, dogs and other figures.

This year, the competition took place under the first floor of the downtown parking structure, the usual domain of pigeons, Probes and Pugeots.

The deck was chosen to protect sculptures from the warming rays of the sun. You know — that warm yellow fellow last seen high in the sky sometime back in September.

**BUT THE ONLY** warmth to be found on this ice festival Saturday was indoors, or in the Huron Valley Ambulance van, parked nearby and idling.

"I just wait here," explained paramedic Kevin Gentry, on hand in case of an unfortunate slip of an ice gouge or chain saw.

"Just a few minutes," called judge Mark Scofield of Livonia to the 40 or so professional ice carvers.

Orange and black power cords snaked from a cement storage shed

through icy slush to wood-topped pedestals ringed with red white and blue plastic bunting.

The professionals "are anyone that gets paid for carving. We have some restaurant chefs, some from hotels," Scofield said.

Many opted for polar jump suits and thick boots and tools, and accessories that included curved and flat gouges, broad and narrow chisels, ice tongs and red cans of gasoline for the few gas-powered chain saws.

**SOME ALSO** kept handy electric irons to help put finishing touches on sculptures, and buckets of warm water.

"They'll mix water and snow and spread it on to make sure any (carved) wings stay in place," Scofield explained.

The cold weather Saturday and Sunday — temperatures only reached into the teens — wasn't quite ideal for sculptors, Scofield explained. "The ice gets brittle," he said, and tougher to work with for sculptors.

Then the HVA ambulance siren sounded to signal starting time, and the chain saws started kicking up fine sprays of snow.

The competition was on.

# Bank robber escapes, police hunt continues

Scoggins said. The car headed east to Main.

"We don't know of anybody at this time who witnessed the vehicle," said Plymouth Police Commander Michael Gardner.

"IF ANYONE DID see anything at that time period, they should get in touch with our department," Scoggins said.

The thief is described as a white man in his mid-50s, 6 feet or 6 feet 1 inch, thin, with dirty blond collar-length hair and a receding hairline, wearing wire-rimmed glasses with clear lenses and a dirty brown long-sleeved overcoat, brown slacks and no facial hair.

"It looks like this same individual was good for two other robberies," Anthony said, one in Oakland County and possibly a second bank heist in Redford.

The robber had a plastic bag which he directed the teller to place money in, Gardner said.

The bank closed immediately after the robbery, and a sign posted in the window read, "Due to an emergency we are unable to serve you."

Minutes after the robbery was reported, Plymouth Police officers were trying to identify footprints left by the robber on the snow-covered sidewalk along Main.

THE FBI reported that bank robberies have been up in Michigan in recent months, and particularly in

the Detroit suburbs. Statewide, 224 bank robberies were reported, up from 188 in 1990. "This year there has been an increase in bank robberies in the suburbs," Anthony said.

Are there more bank thefts in slow economic times? "I've been with the FBI for 20 years, people don't rob banks to feed their families," Anthony said.

Bank robberies are more often sparked by "narcotics and greed factors," he said.

The bank heist Friday happened just two days after a robbery at the Michigan National Bank at the corner of Ann Arbor and Sheldon roads in Plymouth Township.

Anthony said the two robberies were not related.

## Dad renews effort to improve Napier

A recent accident on Napier was eerily similar to a fatal crash last year that killed two Plymouth Salem High School students and it was a stark reminder of road changes that still haven't taken place.

Since the March 28, 1991, accident that killed Ray Carlson's daughter, Tamara, and her boyfriend, Michael Fullerton, he has lobbied Wayne County officials to make improvements between Ford and Ann Arbor roads.

"I've talked to several of my neighbors and we're going to send more letters to (Wayne) county, because nothing has happened, yet," Carlson said.

THE CAR his daughter was riding in north of Warren went off the dirt road at the crest of a hill and hit a tree. The speed limit is 55 mph.

The accident last month was similar, although there were no injuries.

In the December accident, four teenagers were riding on Napier near where Carlson's daughter died, when their car slid to the side

of the road. This time, however, the car didn't hit a tree.

They were luckier than others. In four years five people have died on that road and since 1970 nine have died.

Convincing officials to make changes on this road is more difficult than in most other cases.

SINCE THE road traverses Canton and Superior townships four governmental bodies — both townships as well as Wayne and Washtenaw counties — would be involved in the changes, according to Robert A. Mahoney, Wayne County director of roads. Carlson has made appeals to all four entities, including Plymouth Township.

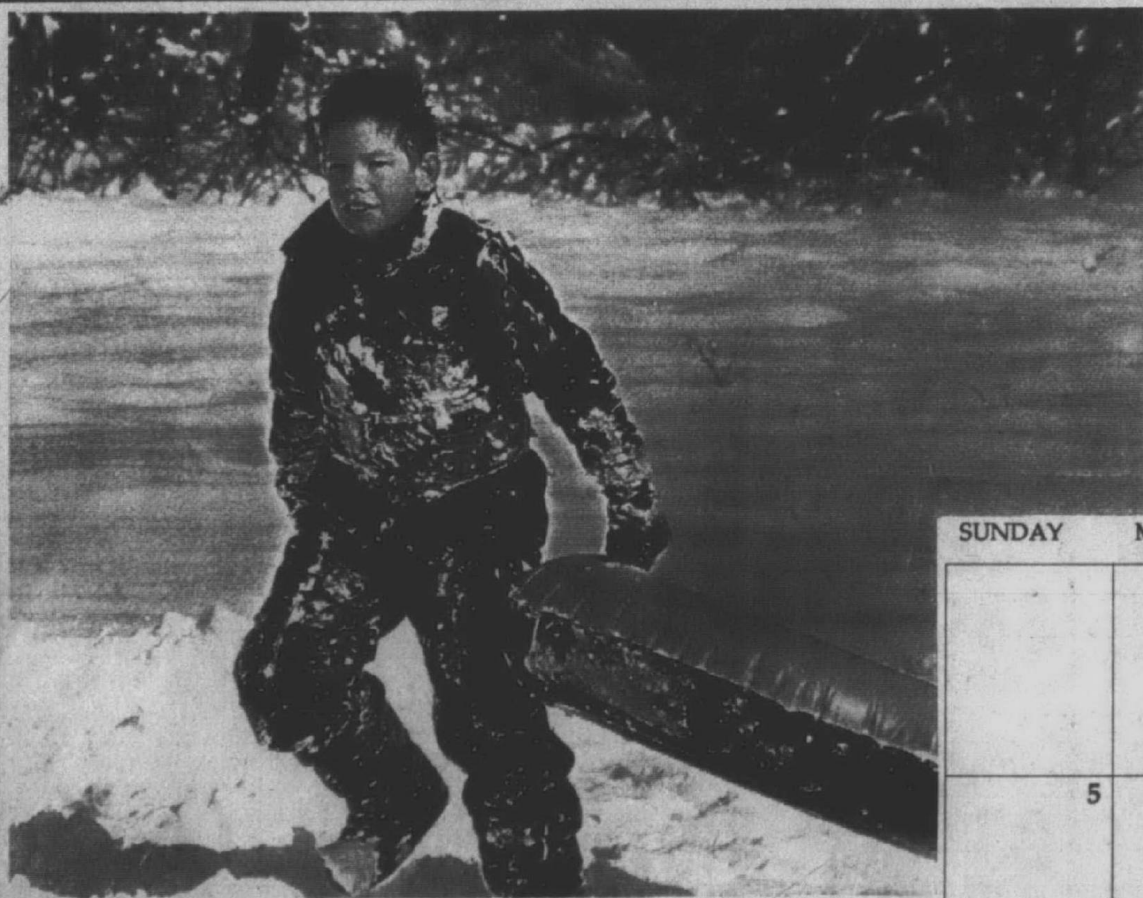
However, Mahoney said he was skeptical about the necessity of work on the road.

"We did say we would go out and see what it would cost for realignment," Mahoney said. "My assessment is that it is not dangerous and people who drive in a reasonable manner don't have a problem there."

Warning signs along the roadway are in place, he said.

"If people ignore those things why put up more? What good are they going to do?"

# Hearings set on reapportionment

A three-judge state Court of Appeals panel will hold public hearings next week in Detroit on plans to reapportion the Michigan Legislature.

Judges T. John Lesinski, Harold Hood and William Peterson will meet in Detroit in public sessions to hear arguments on Monday through Wednesday, Jan. 27-29.

The Legislature itself was unable to agree by Jan. 15 on new districts, as required by the U.S. Constitution after each federal census.

"The Democrats wrote incumbent-protection plans. The Republicans wrote computer plans," said Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Livonia.

Bankes said she would have a more difficult time under her own party's plan because it threw her into the same district as Rep. John Bennett, D-Redford.

She said Republicans Georgina Goss of Northville and Barbara Dobb of West Bloomfield seemed safe under either plan.

Under the Democratic plan, state Sens. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, and David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, would end up in the same district. The Democratic plan for the 17th District would include Farmington and Farmington Hills, West Bloomfield Township, Novi, Wixom, Commerce Township, Milford and Highland.

A newly drawn 15th District, which includes Southfield, Bloomfield Township and Pontiac, would have no incumbent.

Under the GOP plan Honigman loses Bloomfield Township but retains the rest of his present district while Faxon keeps Farmington, Farmington Hills and Novi and picks up Bloomfield Township.

Birmingham, gains Bloomfield Hills and Ferndale under the GOP plan.

Under both the Democratic and Republican plans, incumbent state Sen. R. Robert Geake, R-Northville, would lose Redford Township but retain the Livonia, Northville, Plymouth and Canton communities. The 6th District would add Van Burn and Sumpter townships under the Dems plan and Huron Township under the GOP plan.

Incumbent state Sen. William Faust, D-Westland would pick up Taylor and Huron Township under the Democratic plan. Under the GOP plan, the 12th District would extend even farther downriver to include part of Flatrock and most of Brownstown Township.

Incumbent Sen. George Hart, D-Dearborn, would pick up Redford under the Democratic plan. Under the GOP plan he would lose all but a very small portion of Dearborn.

NEITHER PARTY'S plan came to a vote on deadline day, Jan. 15.

In addition, two maverick lawmakers — Sen. John Kelly, D-Grosse Pointe, and Rep. Tom Power, R-Traverse City — tossed their own plans into the hopper.

The number of state legislators will remain the same: 38 senators and 110 representatives. But population shifts are expected to cost Detroit one of its five Senate seats and four or five House seats. Western Oakland County is expected to gain one House seat, and a new Senate seat is likely for the Macomb-Oakland area.

Republicans hold a 20-18 majority in the Senate; Democrats have a 61-

49 edge in the House.

"We've been through this before. You will see nine other plans before you see the final one," said Rep. Shirley Johnson, R-Royal Oak. One plan threw her into the same district as Rep. David Gubow, D-Oak Park.

REP. MAXINE Berman, D-Southfield, chair of the House panel on legislative redistricting, said lobbyists also are having a tough time dealing with reapportionment.

"Those who are not legislators who have a finger in the pie... I think are less flexible than legislators," said Berman.

"Eight months. We've been drawing these lines for eight months. It's an evolutionary process. When people come in in the last two weeks and say, 'Why didn't you do that?', they've missed the whole process. We probably did do 'that' at one point."

Berman said she expects more plans to be presented by such groups

as Common Cause or minorities. "I don't see anybody happy," said Rep. Jerry Bartnik, D-Temperance, whose Monroe County district could be changed drastically. "I'm depending on the court."

LAWMAKERS have two more weeks before they have to release new congressional districting maps. Those will be more controversial because Michigan loses two House seats — from 18 to 16.

"We'd like to think the Legislature could work something out, but as it probably end up going to the courts," said John Trustcott, spokesman for Gov. John Engler.

The parties are jockeying for position. Democrats, who hold an 11-6 edge, are resigned to losing one of their members. Democrats think one Republican seat should go, too. Republicans think Democrats should take both losses.

The final decision likely will be made a three-member U.S. Court of Appeals panel headed by James Ryan, former judge of the Redford District Court, Wayne Circuit Court and Michigan Supreme Court.

# Blue bin leaves columnist red-faced

TUESDAY IS TRASH DAY in our West Bloomfield neighborhood.

Now that's not normally a major event requiring a whole lot of advance planning or reason to be nervous.

But I was. You see West Bloomfield was about to begin its voluntary curbside recycling program. And I wasn't ready despite the fact that:

a. I am an announced advocate of recycling.

b. I had signed up for the program.

c. I had, sitting in the garage, the regulation 18-gallon bright blue bin which one day over the holidays showed up on my driveway like an orphan waiting to be taken in.

The truth was I had misplaced the information mailed out several weeks before by the township, and:

a. I wasn't quite sure when the recycling actually started.

b. I wasn't quite sure what to do.

AT OUR HOUSE, I have always been the one to put out the trash. You know how, over the years, you divvy up chores? Well, early on in

our marriage, somehow the trash became one of mine.

Dog on the leash from the right arm, trash bag dragged from the left arm, I took out the garbage the night before our first pickup in January with an uneasy feeling.

It was dark, so I didn't really notice what my neighbors had put out. Maybe I didn't want to know.

But Tuesday morning, as I drove out of my driveway and down the street, I cringed in embarrassment. About a third of the houses had THAT BRIGHT BLUE BIN outside, and some of those had bundles of newspapers next to them, either neatly tied or bagged.

My neighbors knew, and they:

a. Hadn't come out in print as an advocate.

b. Didn't work for a newspaper which keeps up with those things.

NEXT WEEK, I silently vowed, it's going to be different. I called the township to ask for instructions. I also happened upon the printed information which I had put aside, but couldn't remember where.

Sunday, I got down to serious recycling.

I combed the kitchen trash can, scouting out empty plastic and glass containers — absolutely no metal was to be found.

The first two plastic containers, after much scrutiny, turned out to be No. 6's. Oh dear, you can only use Nos. 1 and 2. "Are you sure?" I asked my husband. Yep.

I finally had one clear glass jar (acceptable), one green glass bottle (acceptable), and one plastic container which had the right number on it. (We don't eat at home a lot.)

"They're going to laugh at you when they open the bin and find only three things in it," he laughed. "Why not wait until next week?"

"No way. I'll just put the newspa-

pers right in there too."

WHEW! WE HAVE MORE than our share of newspapers. We get the Free Press, the Wall Street Journal and since part of my job is to read every newspaper in our twice-a-week, 12-paper chain, a lot of those come home as nighttime reading.

My husband, late last year, had purchased a wooden crate complete with string made especially for recycling newspapers. I had every intention of using it, then carting the newspapers to the recycling center, but had not followed through.

But now, it was there, ready and waiting for our new lifestyle.

"I feel really good about putting out my garbage," my sister-in-law assured me. She lives in Birmingham which, like a number of our communities, began curbside recycling last year.

I know I'll feel good too, as soon as I can overcome my curbside anxieties.

Get rid of the scorecard, please.

If that can be done, changing our mindsets for the next holiday season isn't too insurmountable a task as far as New Year's resolutions go.

We sorely need an attitude adjustment, to relish homespun values more than a pair of Nikes.

# Station did right thing refusing to air program

due. I commend WJBK-TV Channel 2 for refusing, despite great pressure from several powerful sources, to run "The Little Drummer Boy" this past holiday season.

An animated cartoon adaptation of the timeless Christmas story scheduled to run on Channel 2 as part of a national hookup, this version featured a Jewish character as the little drummer boy whose parents had been killed by evil Arab bandits.

It was a heavy-handed, unintelligent, poorly rendered, insensitive program that tried to trade on a well-loved song but had very little else going for it in terms of artistic merit.

The program depicted Arab-Americans in an inaccurate and brutally unfair light. All the negative Arab stereotypes were there in full evidence — the noses, the garb, the thievishness, the violence.

It's almost inconceivable to me that in this day and age of increasing cultural diversity and cultural divisiveness, the top executives of a major American network could be ignorant or uncaring enough to consider running such a program on national television.

THE AMERICAN people represent a great, wonderful, vibrant mosaic of races and religions and ethnic cultures.

If this country's television networks don't become sensitized enough to assume a leadership role in portraying each group in a respectful and dignified light, they will be guilty of contributing to a dangerous and growing divisiveness that's spreading across the land. All this, in an era when Americans all need to pull together — not apart.

The alarming successes of David Duke and other vicious demagogues like him make it abundantly clear that there is a vast and growing wave of resentment and prejudice among an as-yet-unknown but substantial number of Americans.

Programs like "The Little

"Drummer Boy" fan the flames of those prejudices and play right into the demagogues' hand. I presume this was far from the network's intention. But we should all be proud that its affiliate station here recognized the danger and injustice in running the program and resisted pressure to do so.

I TAKE PARTICULAR pleasure in offering Channel 2 this praise, because in the recent past I didn't feel they were so deserving. During the 1989 Christmas season, the station ran a pious editorial condemning the new fair-to-all holiday policy I had initiated as assistant superintendent of Rochester Schools. The station also came out and filmed some stories on me when I and the Rochester Board of Education were under heavy siege by parents who wanted me fired because of that policy and for other similar reasons.

The station gave the angry parents plenty of air time, but they edited out nearly all of my explanatory comments and made it almost appear that I was some kind of bigot. What I was doing was fighting bigotry.

To give the TV people the benefit of the doubt, I don't believe they had taken the time to research the situation sufficiently to quite grasp which direction I was coming from on all of the issues.

I relish their recent stand on "Drummer Boy." Channel 2's square again with me.

Credit where credit's due.

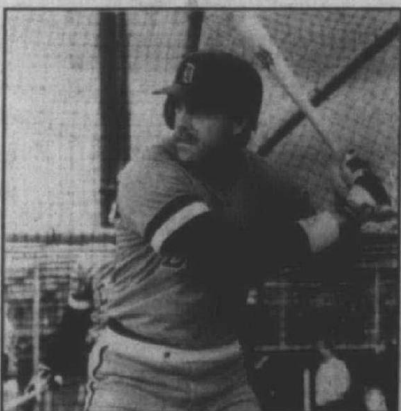

# U.S.-Mexico trade pact called bad for workers

The recent U.S.-Mexico free trade pact will hasten the loss of U.S. jobs and cripple the ability of remaining U.S. plants to compete, according to those who testified at a U.S. House hearing Friday in Westland.

More than jobs are lost as U.S. companies relocate to Third World countries, United Auto Workers President Owen Bieber said. Continuing loss of U.S. technology spells grim times for union and non-union workers alike.

against low wage workers who had the technology their low wage countries could afford," Bieber said. "Now, they have modern technology."

The hearing focused on a bill, sponsored by Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, that would provide advance notice and increased benefits for U.S. workers laid off by companies who move operations to other countries.

"YES, I do think it will cost companies money," said Ford, whose district includes southern Livonia, Westland, Garden City and Canton. "But if they're going to move people out of Wayne to go to Brazil, then they're going to have to pay."

Companies would be required to provide workers with six months' job loss notice as well as four weeks' severance pay for each year of employee service. Workers would also receive an additional 12 months' health care coverage, accelerated early retirement benefits and reimbursement for retraining and relocation.

The bill would apply to countries whose average wages are at least 50

percent below those paid in the U.S.

Though Ford said no one country was specifically targeted, the bill would particularly apply to Mexico. There, automotive workers employed by U.S. firms earn as little as \$4.50 a day.

THOUGH THEY didn't testify, several dozen UAW workers were among those who attended the hearing.

"I was down at our sister plant in Hermosillo (Mexico)," said Grover Shepard, of Livonia, a UAW bargainer at the Ford Assembly Plant in Wayne. "They have beautiful supermarkets down there, just like Farmer Jack. But when I picked up a six pack of beer it was \$4.50. That shows you these people can't buy the cars they make. All those cars are made for the U.S. market."

Fellow UAW bargainer Michael Justice of Redford Township said workers at the local plant had been laid off for 17 weeks last year.

"It's tough, people are living from paycheck to paycheck," he said.

In contrast, Ford read a newspaper report claiming production rose at Mexican plants built by all Big

Three automakers.

BIEBER WAS joined by representatives from U.S. Auto Radiator and Electro-Wire Products, two Michigan firms that moved manufacturing operations to Mexico.

"U.S. Auto Radiator no longer exists in Mexico. It lasted less than a year and a half," said Bernadette Helkowaski, former personnel director at the Highland Park-based plant. "By way of a company merger the product assembled in Highland and then Mexico is now assembled in Illinois. Why create job loss in one state, move jobs out of the country and then end up back again?"

A 60-day plant closing notification bill, sponsored by Ford, passed Congress in 1988 after 15 years of debate.

Reps. John Dingell, D-Trenton, Dale Kildee, D-Flint, Thomas Sawyer, D-Ohio and Marcy Kaptur, D-Ohio, also attended the hearing.

The new bill is expected to receive heavy opposition from the Bush administration, which has called new U.S.-Mexican trade a major benefit for American industry.

Still, UAW workers said politicians should take heed.

"We pay these people's salaries," Shepard said. "It's time they looked out for our interests."

## Rocks pin Rockets; Canton nips Hawks

Six of Plymouth Salem's eight individual match victories resulted from pins Thursday night, and that was more than enough to propel the Rocks to a 44-24 wrestling victory over host Westland John Glenn.

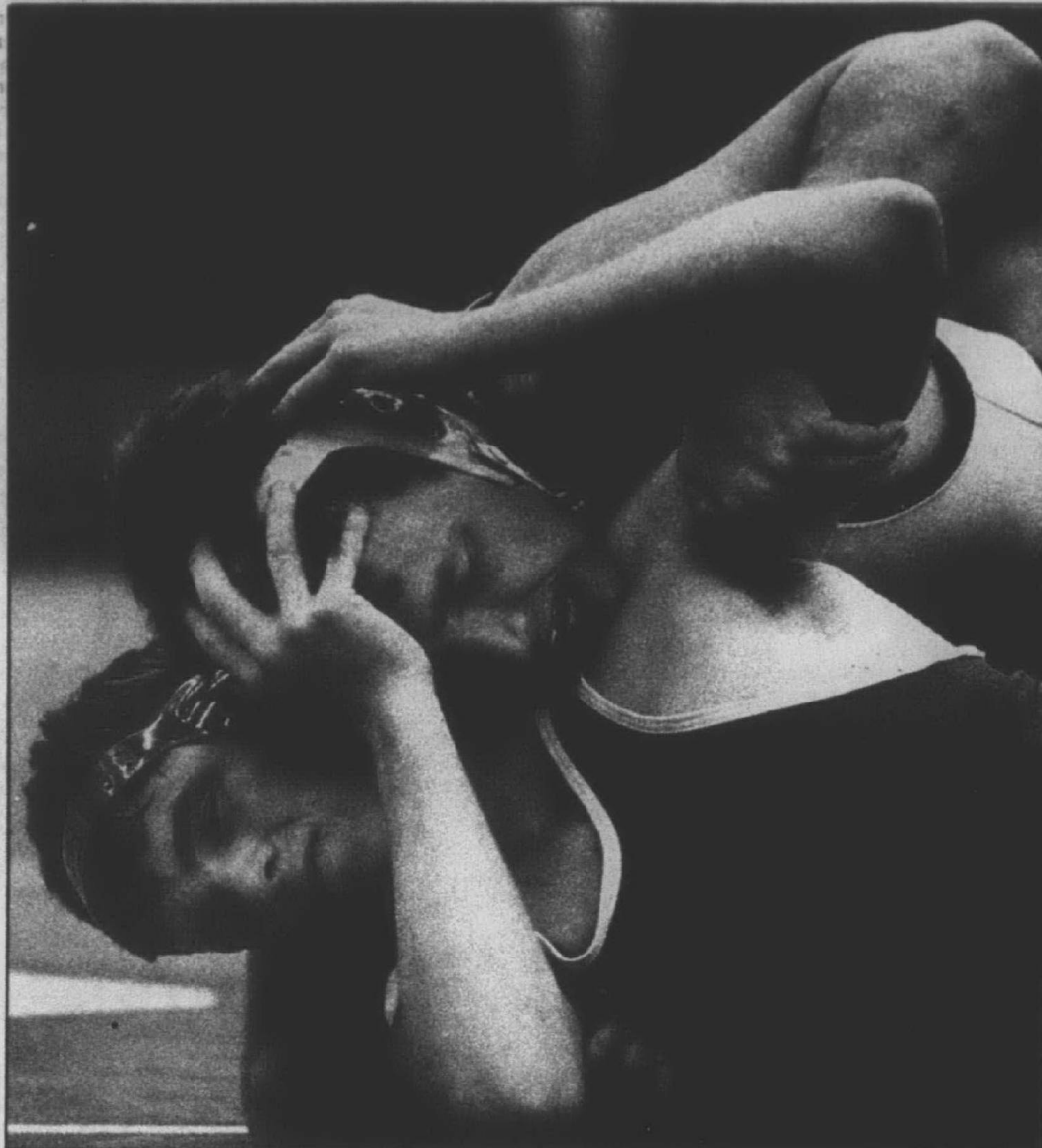
The Falcons are 2-0 in the Lakes Division of the WLAA and 7-1-1 overall.

## Shamrocks put end to Rice celebration

By beating Birmingham Brother Rice away from home Friday night, Redford Catholic Central finally ended the beating it has heard the past three years inside the visiting locker room.

CC's 66-52 boys basketball win snapped a three-game losing streak at Rice and also gave Bob Kummer's ears a rest afterward in the locker room.

"Every year after we lose to Rice, they pound on the doors and we've got to sit in here and listen to it," said Kummer, pointing to the doors between the two locker rooms. "It's been eating at me for four years. I did not want to listen to that again."

CC silenced a fourth-quarter rally by Rice and then made eight of its last nine free throws to win its fifth straight and improve to 7-1 overall. The win left CC all alone atop the Catholic League's Central Division at 3-0.

"THAT'S ALWAYS good because then they have to chase you," CC coach Bernie Holowicki said.

Rice, which made only 21-of-64 shots from the field (33 percent), fell to 5-4 overall and 1-2 in the Central Division. Rice's 6-foot-10 senior center Paul Grant scored 21 points on 10-of-20 shooting but missed a 2-foot shot and was called for an offensive foul in the last two minutes when Rice was

trying to cut into a seven-point CC advantage.

Senior guard Ken Harris was the only other Warrior in double figures with 13 points. Grant is a load inside for the Warriors, but the senior who has signed with Boston College had his hands full with CC's two 6-6 twin stars Kummer and Chad Varga.

Kummer is headed for the University of North Carolina-Charlotte and Varga to the University of Richmond.

"Everyone is going to double-team Paul, but I'll tell ya, Paul missed his share of shots, too," Rice coach Frank Carrico said. "It's been a problem the whole year — we're shooting around 35 percent as a team. I feel very discouraged. We played hard, but until

we learn to play smart, concentrate and keep our composure, this team will never be any good."

VARGA, WHO PICKED up his fourth foul with 4:54 left, led all scorers with 27 points and 10 rebounds, while Kummer contributed 19 points and seven rebounds.

Not many high school teams can boast more height than CC but the Warriors do with Grant next to 6-8 senior forward Jeff Mishko (eight points) on the frontline.

"Both Chad and Bobby played smart," Holowicki said. "They got a little taunted earlier but didn't lose their cool. They have some tough, big-time people on Rice. Hell,

there's not too many college teams as big as they are."

Kummer and Varga earn most of the praise they get but on this night Holowicki was eager to give support players Tom Laco, Andy Slankster, Sean Gallagher, Will Marcoux and Eric Justice their due.

The Rice cheering section chanted "weasel" every time the 5-6 Justice touched the ball for the Shamrocks, but the junior guard played big when he re-entered the game in the final four minutes.

## Chiefs struggle but top Falcons

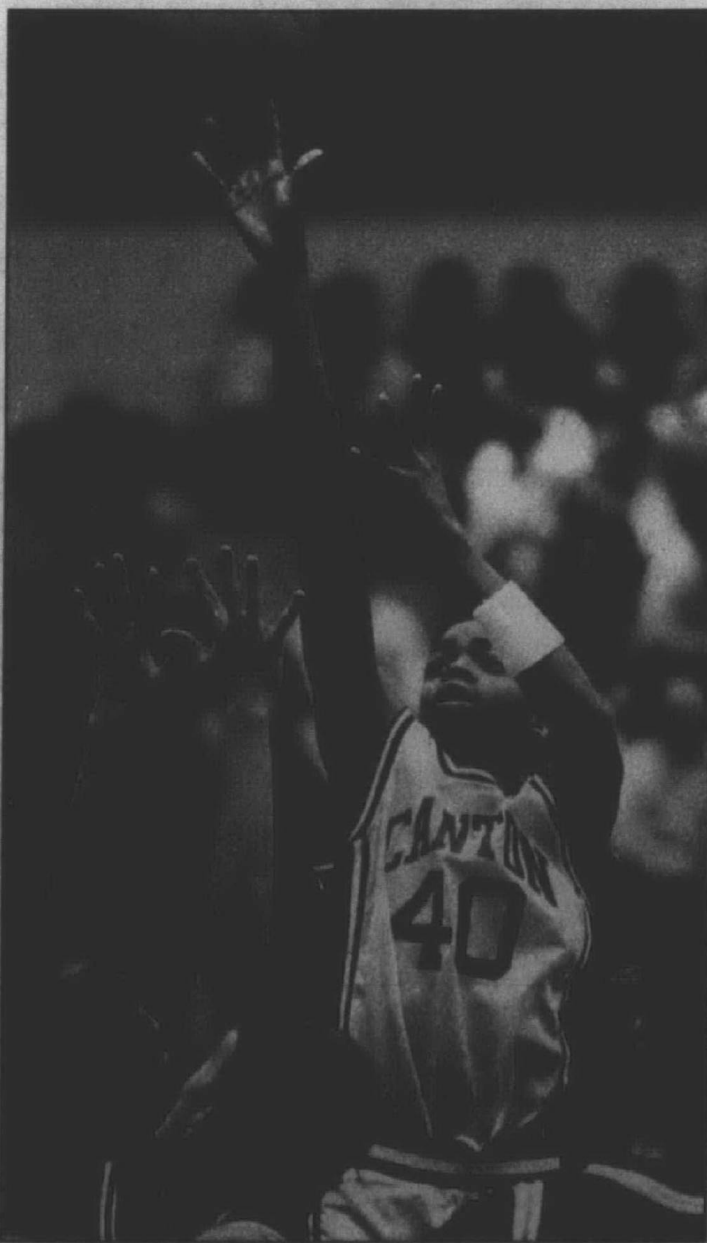

Paul Gilvydis — all six feet, eight inches of him — stood tall Friday night.

The senior center broke loose for 28 points and grabbed 15 rebounds, powering Farmington Hills Harrison to a 61-57, overtime victory over visiting Plymouth Salem in a Western Lakes Activities Association basketball encounter.





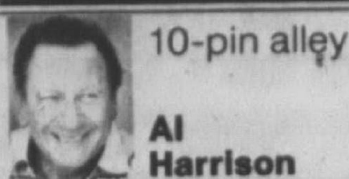
"Right now we're searching for answers. We haven't found our chemistry, and the coaching staff is frustrated. We're trying to figure out which buttons to push."

# Veteran grid coach retires again

Walt Bazylewicz, who kept the Redford Bishop Borgess football program going the last three falls, has decided to make a move of his own.

After guiding Borgess to a three-year record of 12-15, the 69-year-old Bazylewicz on Monday confirmed he has resigned as head coach of the Spartans.

Bazylewicz said he made up his mind prior to the first game last fall

but didn't let his players know until the end of the season. Despite dwindling enrollment and a small coaching staff to work with, Bazylewicz led the Spartans to a 5-4 record last fall and a 6-3 finish in 1990.

Borgess suffered through a 1-8 campaign in 1989, his first at the helm.

"I felt this was going to be the last year (at Borgess), win, lose or draw," Bazylewicz said. "I came there to help restore the program and I felt I did what I could do and it's time to move on. I really enjoyed it. It got

me back in the fire of it and I really felt good about coaching and teaching."

WORKING LONG hours, even in the off-season, helped Bazylewicz decide to resign. Although he has ruled out head coaching again, Bazylewicz said he hopes to land a job as an assistant on the high school level for the 1992 season.

"I was there (at Borgess) in the winter, getting a weight program going, making sure the kids were going to class, running the concessions on Bingo nights . . . in the

Catholic League you fund raise, do everything you have to do to keep a program going," Bazylewicz said. "I said, 'Gee, I'm putting too much time into this job.'"

Bazylewicz, who also coached football at Redford St. Mary's, Harper Woods Notre Dame, Dearborn Heights Riverside and Detroit St. Thomas, has a career record of 172-61-5.

Bazylewicz came out of retirement to take over the Borgess job after being the Catholic League Director for 15 years.

## Crowbar Hotel finds lyrical groove

On first appearance, Crowbar Hotel bears resemblance to a typical lounge act. Neon lights, keyboards and the ceiling fan whirling above could be construed as cursory indictments.

But when John "Jones" Latini takes a left-handed stab at his guitar and growls into the microphone, the misconception quickly fades like smog in a windstorm. Crowbar Hotel is nothing less than an engagingly tight live outfit.

Tearing through an hourlong set at Sully's, the five-man outfit touches all the bases. There's inflections of experimental jazz, a few howls of blues inspiration and world music sensibilities with the veneer of gritty, urban rock'n'roll expression.

"Certainly there's a groove going," said Latini, in his distinct Queens, N.Y., voice. "I think the songs are somewhat intellectual. The words are made to be listened to and people will listen to them if you put them across in the right way."

If Crowbar Hotel hasn't figured out the right way, the band at least holds the map.

THERE HAVE been a few detours, though, in Crowbar Hotel's emergence of the last nine months. The band's roots on the area circuit actually extend back three years.

Kurt Wolak and Latini were members of Private Drive, an ambitious outfit whose energetic live sets featured an assortment of covers and

original numbers. That association, though, "crashed."

Latini and Wolak — whose clinical and analytical nasal tone contrasts that of his collaborator — found a new set of musicians who shared in their vision. They enlisted lead guitarist Bob Groves and bassist John Bisceglia.

"We found players that fit the style of music we play," Wolak said. "We're a little more composed now. The songs are distinctive for reasons other than Jones' voice."

The most important addition is more than just music for Latini. His younger brother Jim "J.B." Latini left his home in New York to join, making Crowbar Hotel's lineup complete. His tenacious style of drumming provides an edge.

For his older brother John it's a chance to make up for lost time.

"I get to know him now and hang out with him," John Latini said. "We get to shoot hoops and stuff like that. We had eight years between us (John is 32, Jim is 25). When you're young, it seems like a lot. With him moving here it's just peer to peer now."

WITH HIS arrival comes a legacy of Latini songwriting. Both John and Jim collaborated on numbers in New York bands they played in. Those numbers have been imported into the Crowbar Hotel's blistering sets and on the band's EP "The Starting Five." Other band members have contributed songs in what has become an all-originals attack.

Several numbers embrace the energy and uncertainties of urban life, seemingly sketched in

chalk on a neighborhood curbside. Latini's lyrics possess a combination of Elvis Costello's wry wit and Lou Reed's piercing commentary.

And in an area where visits to the city are viewed with wariness and outright abhorrence, songs like "Schoolyard Sweetheart" seem to be almost a celebration of urban dwelling.

Part of the reason is certainly Latini's gravelly voice, which sounds like he's gurgling a mixture of metal shavings and whiskey. So soulful and heartfelt, he can lend immediacy and authenticity to politically charged numbers like "Freedom Road" without sounding the least bit naive.

CERTAINLY, not lost, though, is the musical adroitness of Wolak on keyboards, Groves on guitar, Bisceglia on bass and brother Jim Latini on drums. The band sways easily a rock cop rave-up like "Red Light" to complex jazz-tinged numbers. The group has always put a lot of stock into their live shows. The studio version of Crowbar Hotel has yet to reach fruition, though the band's EP is a viable product by any standard.

Talks include releasing a self-produced compact disc, which would be recorded in a basement studio Wolak is building. In the meantime, Crowbar Hotel is happy to play the stage.

"Our influences and emotions are coming out through the vehicle of music," Latini said.

Crowbar Hotel performs Tuesday, Jan. 21, at the Blind Pig, 208 S. First, Ann Arbor. The band also performs Wednesday, Jan. 29, at Sully's, 4758 Greenfield, Dearborn. For information, call 846-1920.

### MONKEYSUIT — Hannibals

The Hannibals second release, "Monkeysuit," is more than a musical statement from one of the area's more formidable bands. There is a need here to transcend the restrictive boundaries imposed by the "college circuit." And yet they have to cater to the very audience that has supported them in the past.

The line is a fine one and the four-some doesn't walk it tentatively.

Rather, the Hannibals plunge ahead unabashed with declarative vocals and powerful guitar-charged rock'n'roll. The earmarks of a university-reared band are still there: A tangle of R.E.M.-influenced jangly guitar, a cross section of universal themes and worldly pursuits in the lyrics.

"Monkeysuit," though, reveals a bigger and more of a sonic bite to the Hannibals sound. The band pushes the limit of its abilities, yielding several highlights and, conversely, displaying some frayed edges as well.

"Shaken," the opening cut, features with Chris Geherin's driving guitar augmented with Chris Johnston's end-of-the-tether vocals. This is what the Hannibals do best, using

pastoral imagery to convey a base of reflection and then letting rip with cutting and passionate rock'n'roll.

"Course of Mississippi" has an engaging beat and proudly wears the mud from treading too near the banks of exhaustion with its buoyant roots guitar approach and inflection of blues harmonica.

On "Even As We Speak," the band is quick to dispel any preconceptions of being Midwest, hayseed outfit as this number takes a funky, uptown tone.

If anything will sustain this LP, it's the subtleties. "Monkeysuit," a number about the dreadful emergence into the corporate world, provides an intriguing bit of country guitar resembling the theme from "Bonanza," while "Long Days" with its soft acoustic meanderings and hypnotic vocals rivals "Shaken" as one of the choice cuts on "Monkeysuit."

As a vocalist, Johnston relies on the emotional wail and throaty growl for emphasis. This leaves his voice to sound overwrought at times while, at his worst, as in the turgid "Walk Alone," he is guilty of perpetuating bombast.

Weighed against what the Hannibals offer overall, this might be registered as an observation rather than a complaint.

## It's punk, pop with a Chunk

Superchunk's sound is the unlikely synthesis of anarchic punk and uncanny mainstream pop sensibilities. This Chapel Hill, N.C., quartet doesn't need their alternative credentials validated by anyone.

Superchunk implodes with a caterwaul of noise, grungy guitars and drooping bass lines and sullen vocals. In the stew, though, are delicious hooks that don't need to be counteracted by Nutra-Sweet. The indelible riffs and melodies emerge through passion and virtue of intent.

"I like it to be a combination of things — good guitar lines and good vocal lines," says guitarist and vocalist Mac McCaughan, 24, in a telephone interview. "Sometimes, the vocals are an important part, sometimes they are just added on top of a catchy riff."

The complexities of the band's music would belie any brief summations. McCaughan nonetheless tries.

Superchunk's pulsating power pop is attributed by McCaughan to listening to the radio, buying all sorts of records from "punk rock to the wussiest of pop stuff" and reaching a common ground as a band.

SUPERCHUNK's relative success, critical and otherwise, is credited by McCaughan to good songs and excessive touring.

"We've gotten in people's faces pretty often," he said.

The band had a less than an audacious beginning. McCaughan joined

forces with bass player Laura Ballance and some other friends from his Chapel Hill neighborhood. Ballance and McCaughan worked at Pepper's Pizza while the singer was home from school at Columbia University in New York.

In the beginning, Superchunk gigs were few and came only during McCaughan's break from school. The group managed to release a single on Merge Records, the label operated by McCaughan and Ballance.

Another spell from school allowed Superchunk to record their self-titled

LP, which garnered critical acclaim from mimeographed fanzines to establishment newspapers like the Chicago Tribune.

The band's follow-up on Matador, "No Pocky for Kitty," is eliciting similar praise for its pop-punctuated punk squalls. Reviewers make cursory comparisons of Superchunk's music to Dinosaur Jr.'s guitar blitz, which McCaughan disdains.

# Kurosawa creates a masterpiece with 'Rhapsody'

At 81 Akira Kurosawa hasn't lost a bit of the vitality, poetic insight, or talent for composing unforgettable images. In his 29th film "Rhapsody in August," the respected director creates a complex family drama revolving around modern-day Nagasaki.

A quartet of children spend the summer with their grandmother (Sachiko Murase), who lives in a tradi-

tional dwelling just outside the city. The very westernized kids, sporting T-shirts emblazoned with Brooklyn and M.I.T., are a bit miffed that grandma still doesn't have television, but enjoy themselves nonetheless.

This particular summer they learn about grandma's large family of brothers and sisters (at least 10) when one of them contacts her from

Hawaii. He moved there long ago, made a fortune growing pineapples,

and now invites the family to come out to visit his plantation.

Tension arises through history. The atom bomb blast at Nagasaki at the end of World War II still wears heavily on the townspeople, including grandma who lost her school teacher husband in the city.

She no longer holds bitterness for the United States. She concludes that war itself, not individual countries, is responsible for the wholesale devastation.

**SURPRISINGLY**, it's the kids who pick up on grandma's feelings most quickly. Their parents, young children during the bombing in 1945, selfishly hope their newly forged relationship with the rich American relatives will lead to jobs in the States.

Kurosawa makes his statements with bold brush strokes and imagery. Elderly natives make regular pilgrimages to the Nagasaki schoolyard, where playground equipment remains twisted and charred. The kids seek out these monuments in an attempt to get closer to their family history.

The director has an incredible way of bringing characters to life and placing them in the most beautiful groupings. He delights in photographing the children, who file past the swaying reeds to their grandma's house or linger in amazement at the pair of charred trees ("a double suicide" they call it) that figures prominently in an old family scandal.

You can ponder endlessly the meaning of ants flowing single file up the stem of a blooming flower. Or you can simply enjoy it as one of Ku-

rosawa's incredible color compositions.

In Kurosawa's previous film "Dreams," he oddly cast director Martin Scorsese as Vincent Van Gogh. Here, Richard Gere makes a brief appearance as the Japanese-American nephew who somehow never puts two and two together when thinking about his aunt in Nagasaki. He arrives to smooth things over.

**PERHAPS THE** director sees Gere as the embodiment of American popular culture, which is at odds with tradition throughout the film. It is unlikely that the uncompromising Kurosawa has decided after all these years to start pandering to the international box office.

For Gere's part, he seems honored to be working in a film of this caliber, carefully memorizing his Japanese lines. Like his character, he is a conspicuous intruder in Nagasaki, and overcomes the awkwardness in a couple of touching scenes.

The most ironic thing about "Rhapsody in August" is its timing, opening shortly after America remembered the bombing of Pearl Harbor during its 50th anniversary last December. Kurosawa insists this is merely a coincidence, but has nonetheless gotten us to look at the devastation of war from a unique point of view.

The year's first must-see film plays for a second weekend at the Detroit Film Theatre at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

## Golden age of glamour French Riviera's sophisticated aura endures

The French Riviera has inspired artists, writers and hedonists for more than a century.

Remarkably, its aura of glamour and sophistication endures at a time when high rises and fast foods have destroyed the atmosphere in other Edens — though the visitor may disagree when crowds clog roads and beaches in summer. The region now attracts about 8 million visitors annually.

It was in winter that the aristocratic rich first fell for the charms of this narrow coastal strip between the Alps and the Mediterranean, extending roughly from the Italian border to Hyeres.

Nearly all of Europe's crowned heads were once drawn by the mild climate (48 degrees is the January average; 68 is not unusual).

So uninterested was the upper crust in the Mediterranean's beaches and the notion of swimming that when the famed Negresco Hotel first opened its doors in Nice in 1913 they faced north, away from the sea. Passing through Monaco, Victoria ordered her train's curtains drawn.

Where crinolined ladies paraded, toplessness is now the order of the summer day. The Promenade des Anglais in Nice is an eight-lane race track, three miles long.

A ferocious construction boom threatens to engulf the whole coast in concrete. Yet visitors still benefit from blue skies in winter — the only time that this Cote d'Azur lives up to its name, for in summer's heat the skies turn white.

Carmine sunsets and a tableau of mimosa, bougainvillea, parasol pines and saw-toothed palms complete the picture, from snow-crowned mountains to deep blue sea.

The Riviera's golden age of tourism is echoed in its Belle Epoque villas, the wedding cake facades on its Edwardian promenades and in the coast's capes.

The Palais Lascaris, at 15 Rue Droite, is a fine example of a 17th-century nobleman's home, complete with pharmacy. It is open from 9:30 a.m. to noon; 2:30-6 p.m.; closed Monday. Admission is

Lost empires can be traced in the Roman ruins in the city's Cimiez neighborhood (Les Arenes) near Queen Victoria's winter palace (Boulevard du Cimiez), which is now an apartment complex.

Five green-and-gold onion domes of the finest Orthodox cathedral outside Russia dominate the Boulevard du Tzarewitch, while a crystal concoction of 16,309 stones made by Baccarat for Czar Nicholas II illuminates the Hotel Negresco, at 37 Promenade des Anglais, itself an official historic monument. For more information on the Hotel Negresco call 93-88-39-51.

With 18 museums and galleries Nice has a cultural richness second only to Paris. If one had to pick just one exhibit perhaps it should be the Musee Chagall, at Avenue Menard, built especially to house 17 canvases constituting the artist's Biblical Message. It is open from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.; 2-5:30 p.m.; closed Tuesday. Admission is \$3. For more information call 93-81-75-75.

Regionally, there is the Picasso Museum in the Chateau Grimaldi in Antibes. It is open from 10 a.m. to noon; 2-6 p.m.; closed Tuesday. Admission is \$3.60. For more information call 93-34-91-91.

There is also Bonnards, Braques and Miro at the Maeght Foundation, at St.-Paul-de-Vence. It is open from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.; 2:30-6 p.m. daily. Admission is \$6.40. For more information call 93-32-81-63.

## For warm weather getaway you'd better shop around

We went to Nassau, Bahamas, for the weekend recently and came home to a foot of snow. Micky shows snow in a woolen cap that reads "It's Better In the Bahamas," which doesn't help.

A warm weather getaway at a great price sounds irresistible, but I learn and relearn that old lesson: do your homework. The fine print says that those \$299 prices are midweek, limited in number and priced for the least expensive hotel.

I read the local papers as well as the New York Times, and checked packages available through travel agents. The most popular and inexpensive packages from Detroit are to Nassau, Bahamas and Cancun, Mexico.

I chose Nassau. Pan Am flew a lot of the package flights to the Bahamas, and Pan Am is out of business, so some tour packages weren't available despite the ads.

We booked too late to get 21-day advance discounts, so our package was \$500 a person including Delta Airline flights, land transfers and four nights at the Best Western British Colonial Resort Thursday through Monday.

The least expensive package to Nassau usually includes the British Colonial in downtown Nassau. Prices are higher for Paradise Island, across the bridge from eastern downtown or Cable Beach, up Bay Street a few miles to the west.

I had never stayed at the British Colonial, the only hotel I would consider in town, but I've passed the grand old lady of Nassau often enough. From a cruise ship it's a great U-shaped sprawl of pink stucco wrapped around a small private beach and a courtyard full of palm trees.

The British Colonial has survived, but like many old aristocrats, she

had to go to work. I knew that Best Western had spent \$8 million on renovations since 1988, so I booked it and hoped for the best. I was lucky.

The lowest-priced standard rooms face the parking lot or the street, but they are just as spacious, clean and attractive as the higher-priced garden and ocean views. (The only small rooms seem to be those with one double bed.)

I had made a good choice, but there is always something I miss. Nassau hotels add a 10-percent tax to the published room rate, plus \$2.50 per person per night for maid service. That cost was not included in our package price, so it added \$22 a day to our budget.

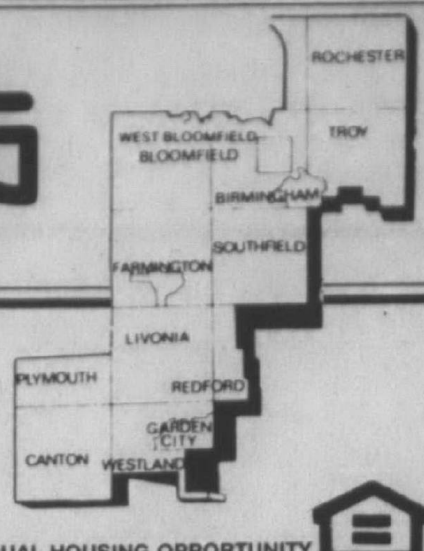

## Family shares recipes

How could I resist? When an advanced copy of "Mom and Pop Udo's Favorite Old Country Recipes From Eastern Europe" (Copyright 1990 by Rita Udo, \$11.95) crossed my desk, I couldn't wait to get a review from a lady who still wears babushkas and housecoats, my momma.

Granted, momma doesn't herald right from the old country as do Mom and Pop Udo, but there's little doubt that she knows her Holubkis from her Hagymas. (For the uninitiated, that's stuffed cabbage from onions.)

But before I get to momma's comments, a little background on the Udo's and how this book came to fruition.

The book was written by Rita Udo, oldest daughter and one of three Udo's who were post-war immigrants from Ukraine and Hungary. Mom and Pop Udo came to America like other immigrants with hopes of building their dreams and lives in the land of opportunity and freedom. They now live in Canton Township.

The book began as a labor of love for family members when Rita Udo, the author decided to compile the elder Udo's favorite recipes as a family legacy. Mom's recipes, coupled with Pop's stories, originated from a time when people fought and struggled for their lives and freedom. At a time when folks like the Udo's did not have much to share, sharing a meal prepared with love and care was indeed a joyous occasion.

One thing led to another and before long, orders were coming in from neighbors and family friends. Now in its second printing, it's very evident the recipes are nothing short of "cooking from the heart."

Not knowing the difference between palacsintas and paprikash, I knew that there is only one person who would offer constructive criticism while enjoying the opportunity to "cook from the heart." So armed with three grocery bags stuffed with picnic hams, kielbasas, pork butts and potatoes, I spent an enjoyable afternoon and evening with the other woman in my life, my momma, and a few Budweisers.

By the way, dad was there too. But like momma says: "Your father will eat anything I put in from of him — and like it," so I didn't expect much in criticism from my family patriarch.

First off, momma commented on the style of the book, ring bound in heavy paper stock with the picture of mom and pop on the front holding a casserole.

"Looks like it was made with the homemaker in mind," was her first comment. She definitely liked the fact that this cookbook could be opened flat and not held down with a can of peas like most others.

The table of contents had momma commenting on the "hominess" of the recipes. It was evident these recipes were "basic fare" that used everyday items in nothing but their simplest ways. Momma questioned the need for a recipe for "picnic ham" that utilized just one ingredient; a picnic ham.

The cooking directions were less than three lines yet the recipe took all of page nine. Momma said it would have been nice to see a recipe for pierogi on the rest of the page.

When it came time to cook, we prepared the chicken paprikash, pork roast and potatoes, mashed potato soup, scalloped potatoes and the angel wings.

All of the recipes met with the approval of the cook and her main taste tester, especially with the mashed potato soup that momma said would be included in her shoe box file. For momma to request a recipe is the ultimate accolade.

The book it is readily available in its second printing at Kitchen Glamour, Borders, Waldenbooks and the Little Professor book stores.

# CULTURES BLEND IN MELTING POT

Patricia Villarruel of Livonia has a busy, fulfilling life as a wife, mother and volunteer.

But she is determined to keep her ties to her native Colombia, where she spent her first six years before her family moved to the United States. Villarruel recalls the warm, sunny climate of Bogota, Colombia's capital, and hearty meals centered around rice and beans, tasty meat turnovers called tamales, and cheese filled cornmeal dumplings. Her favorite beverage was rich, cinnamon-laced hot chocolate.

"IT'S A source of my own identity," said 32-year-old Villarruel, who has a 7-year-old son and a daughter, 5. "I'm proud to pass that along to my children," she said. Maria Castro, a Livonia pharmacist, was born in Peru, near the Pacific Ocean, where fresh seafood is plentiful. Castro is especially fond of the popular South American dish called ceviche. It consists of chunks of raw seafood marinated in lime juice and spices.

"It has to be fresh fish," said Castro, 54. "I tried to do it once with frozen, and it was awful." South American cuisine reflects the cultural melting pot of the region, according to Peruvian-born Felipe Rojas-Lombardi. He is a restaurateur in New York and author of "The Art of South American Cooking." HarperCollins Publishers (\$25 hardcover; \$12.95 paperback).

THE NATIVE Indian peoples of South America cultivated the potato, tomato, chili pepper and corn, so important to local diet. Later arrivals from Spain, Portugal, Africa and Italy also left their culinary marks.

"The food preferences are according to the region," Castro said.

Last fall, Jim and Mary Lark, proprietors of the Lark restaurant in West Bloomfield, showcased the Brazilian barbecue cooking style.

"They are a lot of fun," said Jim Lark, who visited Brazil several years ago. "Different barbecued meats are served on a sword."

The special meal, served on two nights, included two kinds of sausage, shrimp, beef tenderloin, spareribs and boneless pork loin. The meats were prepared on a barbecue grill.

Rounding out the meal were rice, black beans and coconut ice cream.

South American wines also are gaining notice. Darlene Levinson, a culinary arts instructor at Oakland Community College, sampled Chilean wines at a recent wine-tasting.

In Colombia, vegetables and fruit were purchased daily at a local farmers' market, said Villarruel.

"EVERYTHING WAS prepared fresh," she said. Dietary staples include yuca — a root vegetable similar to potato — rice and beans.

Several varieties of potato are featured in soups and side dishes. Plantain, a fruit which resembles banana, is sliced and fried or baked.

Arepa is a dumpling made of corn flour, filled with mozzarella cheese and fried on a griddle.

Villarruel, a former substance abuse counselor, notes that Latino foods aren't identical. For example, her husband Art, an engineer, was born in Mexico. Many of the foods he was accustomed to were different.

"Many countries use the same staples, but they are prepared differently — with different spices," Villarruel said.

Villarruel's recipe for papas chorreadas consists of small red potatoes, steamed, then covered with a cheese sauce, enriched with sauteed chopped green onions and tomatoes.

She makes her special hot chocolate by cooking milk until it is foamy, then adding chunks of cinnamon-infused chocolate and whisking until blended.

Maria Castro and her husband, Pedro, came to the United States in the 1960s. Pedro is employed by Sears Roebuck in Livonia. The couple, who have three grown children, visit Peru every two years to see relatives.

According to Castro, almost any kind of fresh, high-quality seafood can be used for ceviche. The fish is marinated in fresh lime juice, enlivened with onion, hot pepper and spices.

Both Castros and Villarruel belong to a social and philanthropic group called Latinos de Livonia. The group has members originally from Mexico, Colombia, Spain, Bolivia, Argentina and Peru. ## Flavorful Chilean wines a good value

Wine consumers benefit from competition among world wine producers. This is true especially for the medium-to-low-priced segment of the American wine market.

New to the fray are the wines of South America, principally Chile. Quality Chilean wines that have been breaking sales records in other parts of the country are barely recognized in Michigan.

Chile, the long narrow country on the Pacific coast of South America, is sandwiched between the ocean on the west and the Andes Mountains on the east. Chile has 270,000 acres of vineyards, 90,000 of which grow grapes for premium wines.

THE BEST regions for winegrowing are 150 miles south of Chile's capital Santiago. Regions to look for on a wine label are Aconcagua River, Maipo River Valley, Lontue, Maule and Curico. Recent improvements in the wines of

Chile can be explained, in part, by a surge of foreign viticultural investment. The owners of Bordeaux's Chateau Lafite Rothschild, California's Franciscan Vineyards and Spain's Bodegas Torres have each made sizeable efforts to move Chile's wines beyond value-priced, easy drinking varietals. With this interest and investment, there's a lot more right than wrong in wines from Chile.

Chile's soil is good; the water from the Andes is pure; the heat is never excessive; and due to the exceptional climate, vine disease is almost non-existent. However, low production cost is the principal reason for foreign investment.

PREMIUM VINEYARDS, which may reach \$60,000 per acre in California and up to one million dollars per acre in France, cost \$4,000 per acre in Chile. The labor force is experienced and less expensive. Phylloxera, a vine louse that devastated the vineyards of Europe in the late nineteenth century is absent. This

### PLATO MONTANERO

1 pound dry red beans, cooked according to package directions  
½ pound rice, cooked according to package directions  
2 ripe plantains  
¼ cup (½ stick) butter or margarine  
½ pound ground beef or pork  
1 large tomato, chopped  
4 green onions, chopped  
1 tablespoon ground cumin  
6 Spanish sausages (chorizos)  
6 veal sausages  
6 eggs, fried

Set beans and rice aside. Keep warm. Slice plantains diagonally into 1-inch pieces. In large skillet, over medium heat, fry plantains in ¼ cup salad oil until golden. Remove and drain on absorbent paper; keep warm. Discard oil. Add butter to skillet and heat.

Add ground beef, tomato and green onion; cook over medium heat for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add cumin, ¼ teaspoon salt and ¼

teaspoon ground pepper. Cook 5 minutes longer. In second skillet, cook sausages in 2 tablespoons salad oil until cooked through, turning occasionally. To serve, drain beans and arrange on platter with rice, plantains, cumin meat mixture, sausages and fried eggs. Makes 6 servings.

## CANJA

### Brazilian Chicken Soup with Rice

4 whole chicken breasts (about 4 ½ pounds)  
6 tablespoons olive oil  
1 large onion, unpeeled and coarsely chopped  
1 large carrot, washed and coarsely chopped  
2 stalks celery, with leafy tops, washed and coarsely chopped  
1-inch piece fresh ginger, chopped  
1 bay leaf  
1 malagueta or jalapeno pepper, chopped  
2 cloves garlic, unpeeled and crushed  
1 small ear corn, husked, silks removed and cut into 8 equal slices, save and chop 5 of the most tender husks  
1 small sprig fresh rosemary (optional)  
2 tablespoons coarse salt  
1 tablespoon dende or olive oil  
1 clove garlic, peeled and minced  
1 ½ cups rice, rinsed and drained (do not use instant rice)  
2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro leaves  
3 quarts water

Wipe the chicken breasts with a damp cloth. Remove the skins, debone the breasts, and cut them in

half lengthwise. Set aside chicken breasts, skins and bones. In saucepan, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add the chicken breasts, skin side down first, and brown until golden on all sides about 12 to 14 minutes. Remove them from pan and set aside. Place the skins and bones in the same saucepan and brown over medium heat until totally golden, about 8 minutes.

Push the skins and bones to one side and add the onion, carrot, cel-

ery, ginger, bay leaf, hot pepper, and crushed garlic. Stir and saute for about 5 minutes. Add the chopped corn husks, rosemary sprig, if using, 1 tablespoon of the salt, and 3 quarts of water and bring to a boil, while stirring and scraping the bottom of the pan. Lower the heat, cover and let simmer for 45 minutes. Remove from heat and strain through a fine sieve. Discard the contents of the sieve and let the strained stock sit for a few minutes so that all the fat rises to the surface. Degrease the

stock and discard the fat. Strain the stock again through a strainer lined with several layers of cheesecloth; discard the cheesecloth.

Measure the stock; you should have about 8 cups. If not, add enough water to make 8 cups. Set aside. In a saucepan, heat the dende oil and the minced garlic over medium heat. Do not brown the garlic. Add the rice and saute, stirring, for about 2 to 3 minutes. Add the remaining tablespoon of salt and reserved 8 cups of

stock and bring to a boil. Lower the heat, cover and cook for 35 minutes. Add the browned chicken breasts with the accumulated juices and the corn slices and continue cooking for another 5 minutes, or until the corn is tender and the chicken heated through thoroughly. Correct the seasoning with salt to taste. Sprinkle with chopped cilantro and serve. ## Where to shop for plantains and other ingredients

Many of the ingredients used in South American cuisine can be found locally.

Yuca, a fibrous root vegetable like potato, can be obtained at large supermarket chains such as Meijer Thrifty Acres, Farmer Jack and

Randazzo's Produce Fruit Market on Newburgh in Westland.

Plantain — a dark-skinned fruit which resembles banana — also can be found in supermarkets which carry extensive varieties of produce.

But Patricia Villarruel and Maria Castro, both originally from South America and now living in Livonia,

agree: The Latino community in southwest Detroit has the best stock of spices and staples for special dishes.

Along West Vernor Highway, near Clark Street, is the heart of Detroit's Hispanic community. Numerous markets cater to the culinary needs of Latino people.

Here, Villarruel purchases the bars of special chocolate for her favorite hot beverage, and the frozen banana leaves in which her tamales are steamed.

Bagley, near the popular Xochimilco Mexican restaurant, also has several markets which carry specialty items.

reduces planting expense since vines may be planted on their own roots rather than being grafted onto expensive rootstock.

Although the prices of Chilean wines may eventually begin to escalate, flavorful wines are now available in the \$6-\$12 range. The

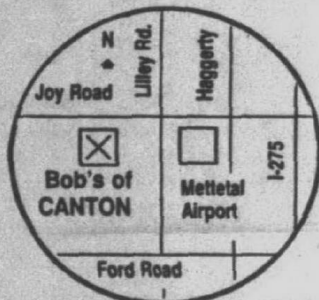
principal Chilean varietals include cabernet sauvignon, chardonnay and sauvignon blanc.

Our tasting of 40 Chilean wines included those from Caliterra, Concha y Toro, Cousino-Macul, Los Vascos, Miguel Torres, Santa Carolina, Santa Monica, Santa Rita, Undurraga and Walnut Crest. Wine quality varies widely and requires consumer tasting before quantity purchase.

SEVERAL CHILEAN white wines were oxidized (noticeable sherry aromas). Chardonnays were simple, straightforward wines lacking definitive fruit flavor. On the whole, the Santa Rita chardonnays were consistently better balanced and fresher. Younger sauvignon blanc and those without oak aging, which tended to mask the delicate fruit, were best.

Cabernet sauvignon and merlot, were of uniformly better quality with moderate intensity and flavor concentration. The best of these red wines showcased blackberry fruit, subtle oak and attractive notes of spice, herbs or mint. In general, they represent good values when compared to many California and French red wines of the same quality.

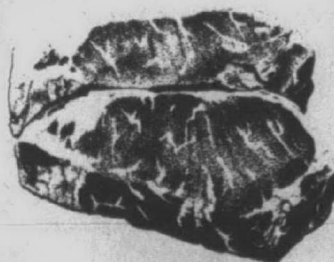

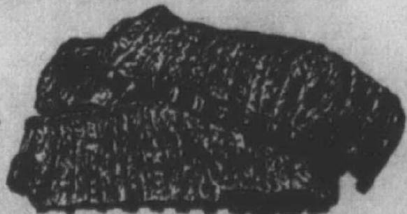

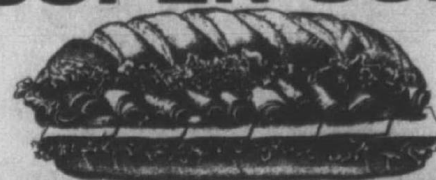

## Udo family cookbook serves up homey fare

### MASHED POTATO SOUP

1 small onion, diced  
2-3 cloves garlic, minced  
4-5 medium Russet potatoes, peeled and diced  
2 14-oz. cans chicken broth  
3-4 tablespoons chicken or bacon fat  
1 teaspoon salt  
½ teaspoon paprika  
¼ teaspoon pepper  
1-2 tablespoons white vinegar  
½-1 cup water  
2 bay leaves  
1-2 chicken bouillon cubes (optional)  
3-5 tablespoons sour cream (optional)  
2-3 tablespoons cornstarch and ¼-½ cup water mixture (optional)

Saute in a medium large pot onion and garlic in fat over medium/low heat until transparent or light brown. Stir in paprika. Immediately add chicken broth and ½-1 cup water to fill pot half full. Add peeled and diced potatoes and bring to a boil. Add salt, pepper, bay leaves and 1-2 bouillon cubes to suit taste. Reduce to medium heat and cook for 30 to 40 minutes. Take out bay leaves. Remove pot from heat and use hand

masher to mash potatoes fine into soup. Add vinegar. Stir in cornstarch mixture to thicken if you prefer a creamy soup and cook an additional 4-5 minutes. Optional: Add 3-4 tablespoons sour cream and mix well. Serves 4.

### MOM'S FRIED CHICKEN

2½ TO 3½ pounds whole cut-up fryer  
seasoned salt  
1 cup flour  
½ cup breadcrumbs  
1 teaspoon black pepper  
½ teaspoon paprika  
sunflower oil or vegetable oil for frying

Rinse chicken parts well. Season each piece on top and under the skin with seasoned salt. Mix in bowl flour, breadcrumbs, paprika and pepper. Roll each piece of chicken into mixture until covered well. Pour oil into large heavy frying pan until ¼ full. Heat oil until hot on high heat. Place each piece of chicken skin side down into pan and reduce heat to medium high. Check after 4-5 minutes and turn chicken over when breadcrumbs turn medium brown in color. Fry for another 4-6 minutes and slice the

breast to see if it is cooked through. Remove breasts when done (dark meat requires more time). Check dark meat after 12-14 minutes. Dark meat must be sliced to the bone to check if it is cooked all the way through and the center is no longer pink. Using a slotted spoon, remove each piece of chicken from oil letting excess oil drip back into pan or onto paper towels placed on a serving plate. Serves 4.

### GERMAN APPLE CAKE

2 large eggs  
2 cups sifted all purpose flour  
1¼ to 1½ cups sugar  
1 cup sunflower or vegetable oil  
2 teaspoons cinnamon  
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
½ teaspoon salt  
4 cups peeled and thinly sliced apples

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, beat eggs into oil until creamy. Add flour, sugar, cinnamon, vanilla extract, baking soda and salt and mix well. Fold in apples. Pour into greased 13x9x2 inch pan and bake for 45-50 minutes or until done. Cool, slice and serve. Serves 8-12.

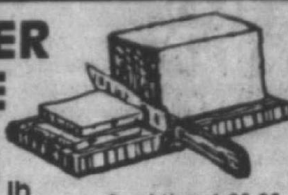

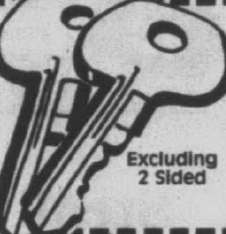

# Book's a lifesaver when cupboard's are bare

After Tuesday's snow storm, I'm through second guessing weather forecasts. I was one of those doubting Thomases with a near empty freezer, refrigerator and cupboards.

Going grocery shopping was on my list, but I put it off. The roads were dry Monday. Later in the day there was a little snow mixed with some rain, but nothing to worry about. "Four to six inches of snow? They've got to be kidding," I said to the weather forecaster on the 11 p.m. news Monday night. "It's hardly snowing. We won't get that much snow." Going grocery shopping could wait, so I thought.

Then came the storm. After a day spent shoveling snow, and navigating treacherous roads, trudging four blocks through snow drifts to the nearest grocery store didn't sound like much fun.

Luckily, I had a new book to guide me — "What To Cook When You Think There's Nothing in the House to Eat" by Arthur Schwartz, (Harper Perennial; \$15).

After scavenging through the cupboards and refrigerator, I found a box of spaghetti, some olives, an orange, and an onion. Everything I needed to make Spaghetti with Black Olives and Orange Peel.

"This is not a fancy cookbook," writes Schwartz. "It's an everyday food book with mostly traditional, mostly basic recipes, mainly updated working class and farm food from many different cultures, for the new

working class."

The book is organized alphabetically by ingredient from anchovies to yogurt with tips for selecting, storing and purchasing the ingredients.

It saved the day at our house — it might at yours. Here's a recipe from the book.

**SPAGHETTI ALL'AMATRICIANA**  
4 slices bacon or pancetta (about 4 ounces) cut into 1/4-inch strips  
1 tablespoon olive oil  
1 medium onion, finely chopped  
Hot pepper flakes  
One 28-ounce can Italian plum tomatoes, very well drained. (Split each tomato and let the interior juices drip out. Then put the tomatoes in a dish for the few minutes it takes to cook the bacon and onion. Drain again.)  
Salt  
1 pound spaghetti, linguini, bucatini, or tubular macaroni such as ziti  
1/2 cup Parmesan or pecorino cheese, plus extra cheese

Put on a pot of salted water to boil, then start the sauce. In a medium skillet, over medium heat, combine the bacon or pancetta with the oil. After the bacon starts sizzling, saute for about 3 minutes. Add the onion and hot pepper flakes to the bacon and continue to cook 5 more minutes.

Add the pasta to the boiling water. Add the tomatoes to the skillet and break up with the side of a wooden

spoon. Let simmer about 8 minutes, until reduced to a thick, chunky sauce. Remove when done. Drain the pasta and, in a large serving bowl, toss with the hot sauce, then toss again with 1/2 cup cheese. Serve immediately with extra cheese on the side.

co-owner of the Golden Mushroom in Southfield, says that in the past Michigan chefs have excelled at the world competition. Among them, Chef Jeffrey Gabriel, Certified Master Chef and an instructor at Schoolcraft College in Livonia.

## Low-fat steak stew perfect for chilly days

**HOT-LUNCH STEAK STEW**  
1/2 pound boneless beef top round steak  
Pepper  
Non-stick spray coating  
1/2 of a 16-ounce package (2 cups) loose-pack frozen zucchini, carrot, cauliflower, lima beans and Italian beans  
One 14 1/2-ounce can beef broth  
1 teaspoon dried Italian seasoning, crushed  
One 15-ounce can tomato sauce with onion, celery and green pepper  
1 tablespoon cornstarch  
2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce  
1/2 teaspoon sugar  
1/2 of a 15-ounce can garbanzo beans, drained

Trim fat from meat. Thinly slice meat across the grain into bite-size strips. Sprinkle with pepper. Spray a cold large skillet with non-stick coating. Heat skillet over medium-high heat. Stir-fry meat for 1 to 2 minutes or until brown. Add vegetables, beef broth and Italian seasoning. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 5 to 8 minutes or until vegetables are tender.

Meanwhile, in a small mixing bowl stir together tomato sauce, cornstarch, Worcestershire sauce and sugar; stir into the meat mixture. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Cook and stir for 2 minutes more. Stir in garbanzo beans; heat through. Serve immediately or freeze and reheat as directed below. Makes 4 servings.

Note: To tote this stew to work or school, pour it into four microwave-safe freezer containers. Cool, then freeze until solid, at least 6 hours or overnight. In the morning, pack the frozen stew in an insulated lunch box or in a bag with an ice pack. To thaw and heat, cook, covered, on 100 percent power (high) for 5 to 7 minutes or until heated through, stirring once.

# "American Music Awards" come 'round again

## Hammer is host, Brown gets his due

When Dick Clark and the production company bearing his name announced the creation of "The American Music Awards" in 1973, it may have been easy to question the motives behind the show. After all, the Grammy Awards existed, didn't they? So did the annual presentation of trophies from the Country Music Association, the Rolling Stone Reader's Poll, the Playboy Music Poll, and year-end salutes from industry magazines like *Billboard* and *Cashbox*. Surely, that was enough, without adding another prime-time TV special. Was it love or music that fueled this new kid on the block, or merely cynical grubbing for advertising dollars?

Audiences responded, however, making the show a success and questions of merit and motive irrelevant. The awards have become a tradition, a significant dot on the music industry calendar and a reliable ratings success. The 19th presentation of "The American Music Awards" will air live on ABC

on Monday, Jan. 27.

The AMAs and their presentation still have their critics and naysayers, of course. What's more interesting is the level of acceptance and significance the AMA trophies have achieved in a relatively short time. One barometer is the calibre of artists who consistently agree to appear on the above, as performers or presenters. Based on ballots distributed to record buyers, the awards appear to have, in public perceptions and among the industry as well, at least as much legitimacy as the Grammys.

The issue of legitimacy is an important one. There's a strong argument that no one set of awards can accurately reflect and acknowledge the width and complexity of contemporary music. Perhaps it requires several such endeavors, each filling a slightly different agenda. If so, the AMAs have done their part, leading the Grammys in recognizing the fields of rap and heavy metal.

This year's show promises once again to offer a well-executed, fast-paced thumbnail sketch of the face of popular music. The show is

relatively slick, perhaps, but often wildly spontaneous by normal network standards. Serving as hot for this year's show is Hammer (hold the M.C., please), the smiling rapper who's gained unlikely enter into America's living rooms. The list of performers continues to fluctuate, but audience can trust that the fields of rap, heavy metal, country, dance and adult contemporary will all be amply represented.

C&C Music Factory and Color Me Badd lead the pack in nominations, with six each. Veterans like Rod Stewart and Luther Vandross join newcomers such as Boyz II Men and Mariah Carey in competition for AMA trophies. "Unforgettable," Natalie Cole's tribute album to her father, is nominated for several awards, while Extreme's moving "More Than Words" seems a favorite for Favorite Pop/Rock Single.

The highlight of this year's show, however, will surely be the moment when James Brown steps up to receive the 1992 Award of Merit. The last few years have not been easy for the Godfather of Soul, and this type of recognition is long overdue.

### 'Dynamo Duck' will (ouch) quack you up

Nestled amid Fox Children's Network's Saturday morning programming ore, a tiny gem of a program glimmers among the layers of animated adventure and breakfast-cereal commercials. Lasting only two minutes at a time and starring a cast of live, strangely cooperative animals, *The Adventures of Dynamo Duck* is prepared to strike unsuspecting funny bones without notice.

In *Dynamo Duck*, Fox has pieced together footage acquired from French animal trainer Jean Tourane to create an original and highly entertaining

interstitial, or connecting, programming device. The down-feather detective waddles in and out of tiny sets inhabited by villainous hamsters, rabbits and guinea pigs, all plotting to trick him with their clever disguises and ceaseless jabbering. Like the great Homo sapien detectives before him, Dynamo Duck allows a string of *femmes fatales* and double agents to believe he's been fooled, then dashes their evil plans at the last minute, which, on this show, actually takes only a minute.

Dan Castellana, a talented comedian who will forever be known as the voice of Homer Simpson, again hops aboard the Fox voice-over gravy train, this time as the voice behind the duck. His circa-1940s gumshoe banter sounds like it was lifted right off the soundtrack of *The Maltese Falcon* and really, er, fills the bill.

### Networks get involved in pay-per-view enterprises

Some guys have all the luck. Promotion is everything in the concert business, and it surely doesn't hurt to have two huge corporations backing you. Capital Cities/ABC Video Enterprises and Madison Square Garden, a Paramount Communications company, have married their considerable resources to develop and market pay-per-view programming. The joint venture commences with a series of music-event programs, the first being *Valentine Vagabond: Rod Stewart Live on Valentine's Day*, to be shown live from the Universal Amphitheater in Los Angeles.

Collect 'em, trade 'em, turn 'em in. Trading cards have long been popular in America, particularly this last year, in which traditional baseball players have been joined in cardboard immortality by the likes of Desert Storm warriors and *Twin Peaks* characters. Now, America's Trading Cards has announced its new line of "Most Wanted Fugitive" cards for the serious collector/bounty hunter. Each "state-of-the-art" card features a bad guy's photo and description, plus a full-color typical scene in which the criminal might be lurking. A list of phone numbers in dozens of states is provided so that the eagle-eyed consumer may alert the proper authorities.

How much is enough? NBC, which has secured broadcast rights to the 1992 Summer Olympics, is apparently milking the quadrennial sports event for every last drop of revenue. In addition to the regular coverage offered free on the airwaves, the network, in a ground-breaking partnership with Cablevision, will be hawking their pay-per-view *Olympics Triplecast* on the side. This more extensive coverage will be provided live and commercial-free simultaneously on three channels, so cable fans can be as zealous as they want to be.



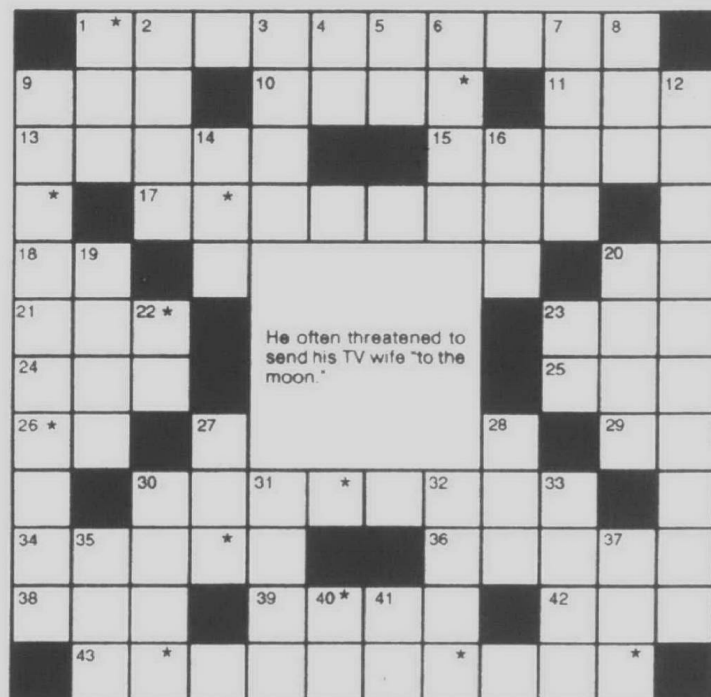

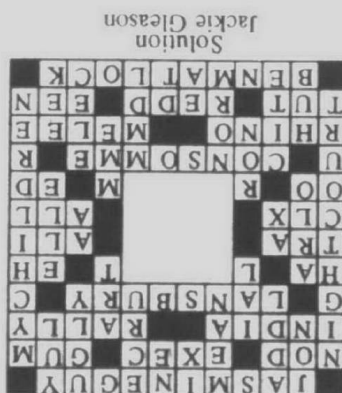

## 'MTV Sports' has its highs and lows

The music and sports worlds collide this week when *MTV Sports*, the latest in a proliferation of cable magazine shows, makes its debut.

What is supposed to be an MTV approach to reporting sports, from the conventional to the bizarre, comes off as choppy and disjointed, and the coverage is so superficial that it does little more than whet the viewer's appetite. It's unfortunate, too, because the segments on Building, Antenna, Span, Earth (B.A.S.E.) and bungee jumping and the profile of sky-surfer Patrick de Gayardon merit better treatment.

However, the first episode has its highlights. The feature on de Gayardon includes breathtaking footage of him "hanging ten" on waves of air over the French Alps. And when one bungee jumper gasps and sputters, "It's good to be alive," after she takes the plunge, real insight into the adrenaline rush daredevil athletes experience comes through in the biting audio track.

On the other hand, the time devoted to the World Mud Bowl could have been better spent expanding one of the other segments. There's also the obligatory weekly vignette on "Rock 'n' Jock" style events, featuring celebrities from the music, movie and television industries that begins with a racing school attended by Donny Osmond and Poison's Rikki Rocket.

## Reader admires stage, screen actor Hal Holbrook

**Q: I'd like to know about Hal Holbrook. I have always admired him. I'd like to know where he was born and anything about him. Also, where could we write to him?** —Audrey Clark, Park Falls, Wis.

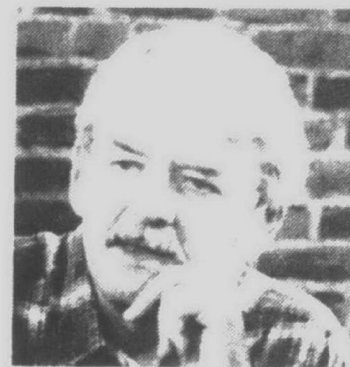
**A:** Holbrook was born in Cleveland, Ohio, on Feb. 17, 1925. His parents abandoned him when he was two years old and he spent what he calls "Huck Finnish summers" growing up. Perhaps it gave some special insight into Mark Twain; at any rate, his one-man show about the 19th-century humorist, *Mark Twain Tonight!*, is one of the most successful solo theatrical productions in history. Holbrook has performed it more than 2,000 times in the United States and abroad. The actor conceived the idea for the show during leaner years to give himself an alternative to working at Macy's. He performed it in 1955 in San Francisco and made a hit with it off-Broadway in 1959. Holbrook has appeared in numerous other stage productions, films and television programs, including *Designing Women*, on which he appeared with his wife, Dixie Carter, and the current hit *Evening Shade*. The marriage to Carter is his third; he has two children from previous marriages. Holbrook's agent has asked that his address not be published.
