Hearing addresses cable gripes

Plymouth Township residents who have problems with cable TV reception have a chance to air gripes in public.

Township trustees have scheduled public hearing as part of a franchise renewal process, since the agreement with Omnicom Cablevision expires in 1994. The hearing is scheduled for 7 p.m. March 12 at township hall.

"We're hearing that the reception is not good, there are blackout periods," said Treasurer Mary Brooks. Also, some west township residents have called to ask why they can't be hooked up to cable TV.

The complaints, she said, have occurred "for a long time - several years.

BROOKS SAID TRUSTEES want to begin a series of steps needed to either get Omnicom to do a better job of serving residents, or to eventually find another cable TV compa-

'We have a good group of people here. But will you start to drag meetings on longer and longer," he said, as elected officials could be moved to get long-winded before the TV camera

"I would like to hear from people personally," Law said, adding he'd like to see more residents attend trustee meetings.



Ice cream maker loses dairy

> The Cloverdale Farms Dairy, seller of ice cream to generations of Plymouth residents, is the latest business to be licked by a stagnant downtown economy.

And while a buyer could seek the building and property on Forest, the Cloverdale may have sold its last ice

Joyce Kallos took over the business Jan. 24 after the court foreclosed on John and Phyllis Kownacki, as they couldn't make scheduled payments to Kallos for the building and property.

Kallos, who sold the business to

BECAUSE A POTENTIAL owner might not be able to lick the problem of how to make an ice cream dairyrestaurant succeed, another use for the space is possible.

The business was founded by Herman Bakhaus, who retired in 1974 after selling the business to Kallos' ex-husband Jim Tomlinson and coworker Tony Gonzales.

Tomlinson bought out Gonzales, and the business eventually passed on to Kallos and sons Jim Jr. and Bob.

The business was listed in 1989 for \$800,000 before the Kownacki's bought it for an undisclosed price.

After they took over, the couple tried some menu changes, sought childrens' parties in an adjoining room and generally tried to make the business go.

BUT ONE Northville merchant said he quit buying ice cream from the Cloverdale, when batches delivered to his store "were either old or

gritty," and included the ice cream produced in between batches of two different flavors. 'It's a bad location for a manufac-

turing plant now, there's not much of a route," Kallos said. After closing the plant following the foreclosure, "I gave a lot of ice

cream to the Salvation Army, the West Trail Nursing Home and Tonquish Manor," Kallos said. City Commissioner Dennis

Shrewsbury said Kallos has talked with someone interested in renovating the building and opening a family-style restaurant.
"This person apparently has only

one major concern: What kind of problems will he have with the city about parking credits and related problems," he said.

New sewer could reduce pollution, end flooding

A sewer line extension, announced Friday, could end a major source of Rouge River pollution - and flood-

But it could also bring new devel-

opment and higher service rates.
Plymouth, Canton and Northville townships said they will extend a new sewer line to the Ypsilanti Communities Utility Authority treatment plant, expanding wastewater capaci-ty, but also eliminating waste cur-rently dumped into the Rouge.

The Western Townships Utility Authority, representing the town-ships, announced an \$81 million con-struction project to extend its major sewer line, already under construc-tion, to the Ypsilanti treatment

"This makes us the first three communities in Wayne County to be in full compliance with the Rouge River Remedial Action Plan," said Canton Supervisor Thomas Yack, chairman of the three-community

The communities are under state Department of Natural Resources orders to address sewer discharges. The line is an alternative to the

North Huron Valey-Rouge Valley "son of super sewer" project, involving other western Wayne communities. Townships declined to join that project, predicting they could meet state guidelines better, and more cheaply, on their own.

PHASE ONE of the sewer line is scheduled for completion this year. It extends the line to the Michigan Avenue/Haggerty intersection in eastern Canton.

The second phase, unveiled Friday, will extend southwest to the treatment plant. It is expected to be completed in 1993. Bids have already been submitted, township officials and

cials said. All three townships are expected to begin sending a portion of their wastewater to Ypsilanti as soon as the line is completed, and to fully join the Ypsilanti system in 19 years when their current, 50-year contract with Detroit explores

be treated at the Ypsilanti plant and pumped back into the Rouge eventually at the rate of 29 million gallons per day. The action will increase the river's flow and its ability to rid itself of pollution

"I don't think we'd be able to water ski, but we can all look forward to the day when we can once again fish in the Rouge," Yack said.

Construction costs are being paid for through a sewer surcharge in Plymouth and Northville townships. Plymouth township residents pay and additional \$16 per quarter to pay off construction bonds, Supervisor Gerald Law said.

CANTON IS setting aside tap-in fees from new construction for the

For Plymouth Township, the new line means an end to combined sewer overflows. Overflows are caused by old, outmoded combined sewers that dump both storm water and human waste into the Rouge during

Water from Plymouth Township's six combined sewer drop points will soon be carried to Ypsilanti, easing Rouge pollution.

For Northville Township, the new line means increased capacity, potentially spurring development

For Canton, the county's fastestdeveloped community in the past decade, the new line greatly expands capacity, eliminating sewer backups and flooding

Northville Township expects major housing, recreation and office development on 930 acres of land formerly owned by Wayne County.

Plymouth and Canton township officials, however, downplayed the impact the new sewer could have on development in their communities.

"This isn't going to spur growth,"

Law said. "We have about 25,000 people now and I doubt we'd ever

grow much beyond 30,000."
Yack said he belianed the lines would more likely be used by developments already under way than

spur additional development. New sewer rates are hard to-predict, Yack said. "As it is, Detroit is already talking about increases.

The new line, he added, should exempt all three townships from paying for the Detroit system's own plans to ease Rouge pollution.

"They might try to hit us on that," Yack said. "But our message is that, with this line, we've already done our part.'

The in-service will help teachers to better imple-

ment the district's newly revised math curriculum in their classrooms," Church said.

The program is presented by the Center for Innovation in Education, a non-profit educational consulting firm based in California.

A variety of activities will be presented to help students better understand and use mathematics. Topics covered include whole numbers, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, geometry, measurement and algebraic ideas.

The "Math: A Way of Thinking" program is just one of more than 15 math in-services held this year for teachers in the district.



When Brenda Wilson donated her kidney to her husband, Jeff, two weeks ago it started a domino effect of generosity.

Her co-workers at Meijer Hair Salon in Canton kept it going. One idea led to another until they decided to hold a fund-raiser dinner party. The money, along with donations collected in a can at the salon, will go to living and medical expenses for the Romulus couple.

And it's promised to go to good use since other medical problems have kept Jeff from working, Brenda Wilson's co-worker Cassandra Janas said. Brenda, a hairdresser, is the family's sole provider.

"I'M OVERWHELMED," Brenda Wilson said last week. "It's an extremely nice thing that they're doing. I thought I'd do my thing, go back to work and everything would be back to normal.

Brenda Wilson remains optimistic, however, she said she doesn't plan to return to work until early April.

Parents: schools withhold info Formal complaint filed

The parents of a Hoben Elementary School first-grader are filing a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education Office for Civil Rights, claiming that Plymouth-Canton Community Schools are refusing to supply them with information they've requested concerning their son's education

Steve and Mary Ann Murray also charge that the district isn't adequately complying with the Reha-bilitation Act of 1973, which requires institutions receiving federal funds to make facilties and information accessible to the handicapped.

The Murrays are the parents of a

gifted student who's had academic difficulties, clashes with other stu-dents, and problems with teachers slow to adjust to his hearing and vision problems, the couple said. The Murrays want to know what

instructional and disciplinary techniques are being used in the class-room and why. They'd also like to see the research that proves that 'cooperative" team learning and the "developmental" go-at-your-own-pace teaching methods in use

AFTER MEETING with staff at his son's school and writing to Superintendent John Hoben and the school board, Steve Murray appeared before the school board last October. A psychologist with Walter Reuther Psychiatric Hospi-tal in Westland, Murray said he was told by Hoben that his request 'was excessive. He didn't offer any reason for that or example of what he meant," he said.

"I think it's a parents' rights is-sue. I'm interested in how my child is being educated. I think as a parent and a taxpayer, I am entitled to know," Murray added.

Murray said that since last fall, he has been given some informa-tion — a copy of the teacher's contract and a curriculum guide.

But the information is insufficient, the Murrays said.

School officials contend they've done their best to be responsive and are surprised the Murrays are

"It's news to me that they need-ed something beyond what Mr. Murray detailed," said Dick Egli, community relations director for the district. "We have worked diligently and spent considerable amounts of time to help him get the information he wants

MURRAY, WHO is blind, "requested that we put the information in a form that could be put in his computer," Egli said. "Initially, our formats were not compatible. We have since gotten other equip-ment specifically for him to make them compatible.

"Since I'm the only planning giv-ing officer, I'm also the director of the planned giving department," Patterson said.

The job includes cultivating and soliciting donations from individuals, corporations, foundations and government bodies by showing how both the university and donor can benefit through options like tax in-

"It is my responsibility to make giving less painless by pointing out the best technique for giving," Patterson said. "This is an area that is coming into its own in most public

"You need someone who is a little knowledgeable, doesn't mind hearing himself talk and has something to



When you have continuing arthritis, inevitably you swing into moods of anger, disappointment, disgust and despair. Generally your good sense and need to carry on bring you out of such dark feelings.

You can tell you are heading into this mood when you feel that people no longer are listening to your needs or are short with your limitations. In sum, you feel isolated and misunderstood. So bothered, you can damage ties with others by letting your state cause you to lash out in anger or spite.

Physicians recognize your state of mind when you make remarks like: "are you sure doctor you have tried everything," or, "do you really understand what I am saying," or, "can't you do better, doctor?" Both your words and their tone carry an edge indicating you are worn down by the discomforts and compromises that constantly dog you.

When you feel troubled, pause. Ask friends, family or your physician the question: "Do you think I am changing?"

These words give that person a chance to respond in a helpful manner. Let the speaker reply without interuption, and listen without considering how to defend yourself. Often through the ensuing dialogue, you can find the words and view to reverse your slide. At times, the pause is worth a month of medicine.

County's proposal to be fine tuned

A proposed ordinance requiring Wayne County to buy American-made goods whenever possible is moving forward, albeit with some

County Commisisoner Kay Beard,

D-Westland, said she's fine-tuning the "Buy American" proposal after last week's public hearing on the or-

"We're going to be reviewing the ordinance and talking to county legal counsel about several items," said Beard, chairwoman of the county commission audit committee.

Domestic content is chief among

the items to be discussed. Committee members realize that Americanmade products might not exclusively American-made parts, Beard said.

Committee members are also considering a proposal that would alter the county bid process, offering greater preference to American sup-

"WE DID hear from a woman who said she lost a county salt contract to a Canadian firm," Beard said.

The proposal is based on a federal law that regulates goods the county buys with federal grant money.

Though numbers could be modi-fied, the ordinance would cover purchases of \$10,000 or more from the

county's general operating budget.
County contractors would also be required to use Ameircan-made goods for all contracts of \$50,000 or

Beard said the audit committee will review the document at least one more time before passing it on to the full commission.

'We're trying to be careful, we want to help American businesses, but we don't want to be punitive, either," she said.



Barns proposal sweetens state's early retirement plan

oung or too leery of the early retirement plan they're being offered might get a crack at a sweetened proposal offered by a local state representative.

Proposed by state Rep. Justine Barns, D-Westland, the early retirement plan would have no age restrictions like the current one. It would still require a state employee's age and years of service to add up to 70. It would make another 2,000 people eligible to retire early.

To attract more participants, the plan would add another five years of service when calculating workers' pension amounts said Barns, chairwoman of the House Senior Citizens and Retirement Committee.

"THIS IS a way of humanely cutting down staff and downsizing state

people who are 45 years old who have been here 25 years. If they want to move up north and be a fishing guide they can do that."

She said such a program would cut down on the number of people the state would have to lay off due to budget shortages, and save unemployment costs. But some officials worry that her

bill is quashing the success of the current plan, which is in the midst of its six-month enrollment period. They say workers might hold out for

a chance to boost their pensions.

Rep. Frank Fitzgerald, R-Grand Ledge, said the cost of the five-year grant would be astronomical.

'It's simply out of the question It's too expensive to do," Fitzgerald said. "The state's fiscal situation hasn't improved. All it's doing is holding out false hope for people. There may be something (else) we could work out as an inducement."

Gov. John Engler hasn't taken a position on the bill yet but will by the time Barns' committee meets to review it, said William Whitbeck, director of the Office of State Employer and Engler's counsel for execu-

tive reorganization.

Engler has opposed early retirement incentives in the past.

William Kerans, a spokesman for budget director Patricia Woodworth, said the current program should be evaluated when it is over before a new one is considered.

Whitbeck said he also was worried the bill would hurt the current early retirement plan in place.

BUT BARNS said the participa-tion rate should be higher than the current 25 percent. Officials were

hoping for 40 percent.

An estimated 6,000 of the state's 64,000 workers are eligible to retire early. That is being at least age 50 by April 1 and with age and years of service that add up to at least 70.

But so far, only about 980 have committed to retiring and another 170 have applications out. About 1,400 are expected to retire. That would save the state about \$11 mil-

The six-month application period would begin in September, and the workers would have to retire by

The state would save money be-cause only half the workers who left would be replaced, and because new hires would come in with lower salaries and less vacation.

State workers have been offered early retirement twice in the past 10

For four months in 1984, they were offered an 80-and-out plan with a \$240 to \$360 monthly bonus until their Social Security benefits began. About 52 percent of those eligible, 1,975 of 3,801, took advantage of the A yearlong 80-and-out plan was offered in 1989, but it offered no monthly bonus. About 40 percent, 864 of 2,179, opted out then.

Whitbeck said additional layoffs would be required this year, in part due to the 4 percent pay raise that went into effect for state workers but wasn't funded in the budget. He couldn't say how many layoffs might be necessary.

The Department of Mental Health expects about 1,300 layoffs due to the closure of several facilities over the coming months.

"Those areas could include tricounty legislative and political affairs; increased communications between chambers and communities; meaningful tri-county programming and business development; and much-needed leadership development," said White.





BY ALL APPEARANCES, the sport coat sitting on the chair next to my desk was made in America. The designer's name is on it, Perry Ellis, and above it in large lettering it says 'America." But in small letters below the words 35 percent polyester, the tag says it was made in India.

Chances are I wouldn't have even looked at the label if it hadn't been for a book that came my way. It's title is "Made in the USA," and it was published by the Made in the USA Foundation.

It doesn't read like an Elmore Leonard best seller, but it does help solve the mystery of where products come from. I'm a ninth-generation American and have prided myself in never having had a Toyota in my driveway or Perrier in the refrigera-

The book burst my bubble. It came my way via Joe Aristeo, a Livonia concrete and excavation contractor. He passed the book out to his em-



ployees, with a letter, which said in part: "You have a choice every time you pull out your wallet. We cannot wait for our inept politicians in Washington to provide leadership on the trade issue, it's something we can solve ourselves. Think about it. Every purchase you make is import-

HE'S NOT THE only one. Jim Livanos, owner of Midwest Pro Painting of Livonia, is also passing out the books to his employees.

I wish I had looked at the book sooner. My last large purchase was a Dodge mini-van. But as it turns out, it's about as American made as Labatts. It was made in Canada with plenty of Japanese parts.

Figuring out what's American and what isn't is a tough task. The guide

· Fax machines. This baby was .nade in America in the 1920s by AT&T, but somehow ignored until the Japanese jump started the business. It's nice to know that 60 percent of the computer modem circuits found in fax machines are made by Rockwell International.

• Furniture. We're all accustomed to seeing some weepy Hollywood star going on and on about sav-ing the Brazilian rain forest. It's the thing to do. Canton captures 2nd in Observer meet

Other teams had more individual champions, but nobody could match the overall depth of the Farmington wrestling team Saturday in the first Observerland Invitational. The Falcons overwhelmed their

area opponents as 11 of 12 wrestlers earned medals (finishing fifth or better) and enabled Farmington to amass 1941/2 points at Garden City High School. 'Maybe we can get ranked on top

now," Farmington coach Al Beyar said, referring to the fact that Redford Catholic Central and Plymouth Salem had been rated ahead of the Falcons in Observerland.


SALEM'S DAN Bonnett and CC's Dan Kelly were named the most outstanding wrestlers.

Farmington, which won its third tournament title, had one champion in Rob Cavagnol at 189.



That has translated into more victories, another of which the Rocks earned Wednesday night when they rallied for come-frombehind wins in the second and third games to defeat rival and host Plymouth Canton (15-5, 15-12, 15-10).

"The kids haven't lost their composure this year," Salem co-coach Allie Suffety said. "A year ago in that situation we would have lost (the game). A year ago we would have gone five games."

The Rocks are 4-0 in the Western Lakes Activities Association and have a key match tonight at home against Walled Lake Central. Salem is 22-5-7 overall. Canton dropped to to 1-3 in the league and 18-13-4.

Salem cruised through the first game, tak-

ing a 7-0 lead behind the serving of Shelby Carey and Cyndi Platter, who had five points and four kills. Caryn Tatterton served the game-winning point, which resulted from her tip-kill.

'We told the kids between (the first and second) games 'The crowd is out of it. Let's get our serves in and get up five or six points,'" Salem co-coach Brian Gilles said. 'But we let them get back in and now we've gotta fight it. We didn't get rattled except for a few points, but that was exactly what we didn't want to happen."

Salem rallied to win, however. After get-ting within 11-8, the Rocks scored the last seven points. Carey's ace made it 12-10, and Platter served the final five points. Martha Bol had three kills, including two on blocks, volleyball

"To be completely honest, at the begin ning of the match, we were a little intimi dated," Canton coach Jacqueline Getz said.
"We finally decided to play volleyball and we did very well.

This season we've had trouble starting In the second game, we were ready to play and were aggressive. But we had some men-tal errors and let them in little by little. Sa-lem is a very patient team and believes in itself."

The Chiefs also are a good team and proved in the third game they can play with a quality team like Salem, Getz said, adding Canton's confidence shows through at times and the Chiefs can play outstanding volleyACES BY Jenny Garvey, Nikki Santilli and Carey and a Carey kill staked Salem to a 4-1 lead in the third game, but the Chiefs rallied for leads of 6-4 and 7-6. 

In Wally's world, there's plenty to poke fun about.

Easy targets such as farmers, geeks, politically correct hippies, wacko roommates, old girlfriends with acne and cities with less than sterling reputations get lampooned with Wally Pleasant's jagged acoustic strumming and piercing voice.


The 1985 graduate of Birmingham Groves High School doesn't mean to be mean. In fact, he wonders out loud if his "Ode to Detroit" cut on his debut release, "Songs About Stuff," might have gone too far.

"I think in that song about Detroit I was a little mean," said Pleasant, 24, who compares the Motor City to Beirut in one reference. "But I was bummed out about that woman (Joanne Was of Farmington Hills) getting beat up in Detroit and when I hear rumors about how the city government doesn't run efficiently, like school board members riding in

Pleasant shrugs his shoulders. Too late now as "Songs About Stuff" is already in record stores. And college radio in East Lansing has chosen to play the Michigan State grad's "Ode to Detroit" with particular glee.

Such is the muse of a singer/ songwriter whose biting commentaries on the (mundane) human condition might rankle a few along the way. Truly Pleasant's songs are his own, humorous ditties carved from

My husband just finished three weeks of intensive day treatment for marijuana addiction at a local hospital. He has used the drug for more than 20 years (off and on with periods of abstinence), and it has been a problem which has slowly eroded the foundation of our marriage (honesty and trust) for the last 10 years.

Finally, at the end of June, I caught him using again (he suppos-edly had been clean for 18 months) and gave him an ultimatum - treatment or divorce.

Treatment was the lesser of two evils, apparently. The issue was brought out by his counselor in the program that Bill's treatment was mostly a "head trip" (intellectual) rather than a "heart trip." His counselor talked about the emotional repression Bill has, which is probably a lifelong thing. (Bill is 42.)

The program did not get through to him emotionally to any great degree, although he found it "interesting, informative, neat" etc. Now he is beginning a six-month commitprogram that Bill's treatment was

is beginning a six-month commit-ment for aftercare, which will involve one group meeting per week plus two NA (Narcotics Anonymous)

meetings per week.

I think a lot of his resentment stems from the fact that the main thing he wanted to do is to STOP SMOKING POT, and this, in his opinion, has been done. Now, he says, EVERYONE wants him to make big changes in who he is as a person, i.e., become less artificial and agreeing with everyone, more genuine, more feeling and emotionally available,

I might mention we are both ACOAs (Adult Children of Alcoholics) and his role was (is) definitely Lost Child. He had no interest in addressing his ACOA issues — feels quite comfortable that the "past is

Anyhow, with this background, my question for you is, are there any "guidelines" on what you would hope to see in a "recovering person," both positive and negative?

After his three weeks, he seems so

burned out on the subject that, right now, the mention of words like "addiction, recovery," etc., cause him to react with instant frustration. Yesterday, he sobbingly explained to me that he is happy with who he is as a person and that he isn't going to be 'tortured" to become someone he isn't to fit some mold.

He is open to the idea of emotional growth, but stresses that he is who he is and has had the exact same personality since he was a small child, i.e., loner, not very social outside his own family, etc.

Is it possible for a person to really recover and essentially be the same person? I've talked to other recover-ing people who laugh and say things like "Oh, you wouldn't have liked me before . . . I wouldn't have liked me before . . I'm a totally different person now, more outgoing and hon-est, able to connect with people,"

This was said by an alcoholic with five years' recovery who really hit rock bottom before he got help. My husband never reached "rock bottom." He has been in a class all his own as an addict, even his counselor agrees. Perfect attendance at work, all house jobs taken care of, fairly good father, fairly good husband,

I have so much fear about his recovery. I am giving myself 12 months to make a decision about my future with him. I might mention we have two pre-teen daughters, which complicates any decision I might

I know this letter is lengthy, but I would appreciate your insight into the question of what to expect with recovery. I have come to know you and respect you through your column in the paper for a few weeks recently. I was concerned that it "went away," so I was glad to see you back this week!

PETER MEDAK, who directed "The Krays" in 1990, shot outside the studio as much as possible, giving the film a gritty realistic quality. He paints another vivid picture of postwar London, where rationing is still in force and large families cram into tiny flats.

Christopher Eccleston, in his feature film debut, elicits sympathy because his Derek is so trusting and vulnerable. You can tell, for instance, that the boy has been roughed up plenty by vengeful policeman when you see him at the trial. His actual capture didn't involve struggle that would result in

Not all of the film works. Derek's sister Iris (played by Eileen Atkins) was consulted in the making of the film and thus appears overly sweet and two-dimensional. A scene in a schoolroom where a teacher confiscates students' firearms is surreal and out of place.

This is, however, one of those rare films that has the power to influence the legal system and the public conscience. Like Errol Morris' "The Thin Blue Line," it has reopened the controversial capital punishment question and may someday clear Derek Bentley's name of the sense-





A whale of a race

San Diego hosts America's Cup Challenge

Although the changeable winds of financial fortune may have brought a chill to preparations for the 28th America's Cup Challenge, which began its trial matches here on Jan. 14, the weather in San Diego is expected to remain sunny and warm, as usual.

And the veneration the competition inspires, along with the revenues it is expected to bring, may yet redeem the embattled America's Cup Organizing Committee and the cup's defender, the San Diego Yacht Cup.

Dennis Conner, who in 1987 won back the America's Cup he had lost to Australia in 1983, and then successfully defended it against a New Zealand challenge in 1988, says tepid funding means he has had to stick with his one and only boat, the Stars & Stripes.

Most of the other teams - at last count there were 10 challengers registered from nine countries as well as another American team competing to defend the cup - will have built at least two boats in the process of selecting one to represent them in the races; several syndicates have built four, at a total cost of up to \$40 million.

Many of the yachts are already installed at various berths around San Diego, and last-minute secrecy - or uncertainty, in the case of the Russian and Yugoslav entries - surrounds the arrival of the remaining boats.

This year's yachts must be constructed to be lighter and faster than the previous racers.

The 1992 race course has been designed for excitement as well. One S-shaped leg of the course ends with boats tacking almost 200 degrees around the home buoy and the downwind last leg of the race gives a possible advantage to the second-place boat.

Races began Jan. 14 with a series of round-robin elimination heats to determine which foreign boat will challenge which American one during the America's Cup Match, a best-ofseven series of races scheduled to begin May 9.

For those wishing to attend the races a variety of packages has been organized by America's Cup Services, Travel Desk, at 600 West Broadway, San Diego, Calif. 92101. For more information call (800)

Rates range from \$221 a person in double occupancy for a three-day stay in budget accommodations during the beginning matches, which end March 25, to \$987 for a six-night stay in a luxury hotel during the America's Cup Match in May.

Observation-boat tickets only with daily rates ranging from \$30 to \$150, can be reserved from the same address or by calling (800) 862-6652.

Providing a little extra excitement at least in the race's early stages, should be the annual migration of gray whales, whose route to their birthing grounds in Baja, Calif., takes them near the race course site off Point Loma at San Diego Harbor's north end. One of the best land vantage points

for viewing whales, yachts and the city skyline is Cabrillo National Monument at the tip of Point Loma. Crowning the point is a restored lighthouse dating from 1854.

There is a glassed-in whale-watching station on the bluff and free movies about whales at the visitors center. Admission is \$3 a vehicle; those containing a United States resident over 62 years old get in free. For more information call (619) 557-5450.







Aromatic paella worth the work

I'll never forget the first time I sampled paella, pronounced (pieeh-yah).

It was a cold, rainy, thunderous night and of course I had to park six blocks away from the restaurant I was reviewing. The name of the place is not important; it closed long ago, another victim to Ann Arbor's ever-changing culinary whims.

MY SOURCES warned me about the size of the portion. Cooked in an authentic Spanish paellero, there would have been more than enough to share with my friend and possibly one other hungry person

For the uniniated, a paellero is a cooking vessel similar to a slope-edged frypan, about 24 inches in diameter with two small grabbing handles rather than one long one, and a tight fitting lid.

WHEN OUR waitperson presented the pan with lid intact, . it proved to be a sensory overload when the lid was lifted, giving forth a burst of steam while wafts of saffron, spicy sausage, garlic and shrimps filled the air.

If memory serves me correctly, I knew I would be a fan of paella forever just for the enchanting aroma. It tasted even better than it smelled.

It was only fitting that the Wednesday after the blizzard of '92 fell upon us, I was rummaging through the fruit cellar looking for my whetstone when I found my paella pan, hidden in the back under placemats, breadpans and numerous springforms. I knew then and there I would venture to the market in search of ingredients for the perfect winter feast of the senses - a pot of paella.

ONE DOES not venture to the corner grocery for paella "fixins". My usual 20 minute drive to Alcamos on Schaefer in Dearborn for chorizo proved to be a little over two hours with the snowfall.

A stop at Anna's Seafood Market just west of Telegraph on Joy Road landed me prawns that had the checkbook gasping for

The cupboard was well stocked with an assortment of rice, the freezer replete with chicken parts. Even the spice drawer had an ample supply of spun gold saffron. By the time dinner rolled around, I was in full swing, anticipating a meal that was sure to titillate anyone's tastebuds, and it did.

Does one really need to have a paellero to make an authentic paella? No. Any large covered casserole will suffice, even those Corning things with lids you received for a wedding present 20 vears ago

WHEREAS AN authentic Spanish chorizo bursting with hints of pepper and garlic would prove outstanding, chunks of a good solid pepperoni would work, and probably offer a more international appeal.

Chicken parts are nothing but chicken parts and most grocery store varieties will do. What you cannot compromise, however, are the three main staples that add texture and aroma like no other.

First, do not skimp on the rice. Forget the instant, boil-in-bags and converted rice here, opt for the real stuff. Settle for nothing less than fresh garlic, if just for

LASTLY, IF you have never purchased saffron before, be prepared for a surprise, one that you will not soon forget. Is the price worth it? You do not make paella without real saffron. Period.

There are two versions of paella that I have tried, both garnering rave reviews. The authentic, made with chicken, shrimps and chorizo, and another like the one at the Ann Arbor restaurant with seafood. You decide, you'll love them both. Trust me.

ENTION "PRESSURE cooker" to a dozen people, and 11 of them will respond - "My mother had one: they explode."

Toula Patsalis is doing her best to dispel the old fears about pressure cookers. "High tech has entered the kitchen," said Patsalis, cooking school director of the Kitchen Glamor stores based in Redford. "The same technology that brought us compact disk players and microwave ovens has been applied to the pressure cooker which ranges in price from \$100 to \$200. Please put it in caps: THERE IS NO WAY A NEW PRESSURE COOKER CAN EXPLODE - EVER, EVER,

ABOUT FOUR years ago, Kitchen Glamor was approached by eight manufacturers of pressure cookers,

Tips for cooking under pressure

For perfect pressure cooking, follow these tips from the woman who wrote the book on pressure cooking - Toula Patsalis.

· Make sure the manual has been read and is understood.

Examine ring and seal on unit as directed in manual. Read selected recipe thoroughly

· Organize ingredients before starting to cook. Prepare them by washing them and cutting into specific size.

· Use proper measuring utensils.

 Check liquid measurements at eye level. Loosely pack dry ingredients and level off straight across top. · Invest in an accurate timer.

· Use heat diffuser on the range burner when cooking pasta, beans or rice.

proposing that their products be used in the cooking classes conducted in the four Kitchen Glamor stores in Rochester, West Bloomfield, Redford and Novi.

"We try to be open to anything new, so we agreed to test them and consider classes in pressure cooking. Well, they're a great toy: I played with them at home for a whole summer, and while I loved the cookers themselves. I also saw how ineffective were the manuals that accompanied them. They were either so simplified that the user was limited, or so technical that the user was put off entirely."

Patsalis began collecting recipes, sometimes modifying them to taste, and developing recipes of her own. The results, 235 recipes ranging from soups to chutneys to cheesecake, were complied into a cookbook, "Joys of Pressure Cooking."

"I WAS really a convert to pres-

sure cooking," said Patsalis. "It's the ideal cooking method for today's lifestyle. We're all concerned with nutrients. Pressure cooking offers one of the best ways to cook vegetables: the colors remain vibrant, the nutrients are retained, and most veg-

etables cook within a few minutes. "And we all work. It's hard to get a meal on the table, synchronized with everything else we do. A pressure cooker can reduce the cooking time by as much as 70 percent."

Patsalis has offered the pressure cooking class in each store twice a year for three years. Average class size is 70 people, ranging in age from 25 to 70. Some of the older women are still using their 50-year-old Pres-

"The new generation of pressure cookers are stainless steel with an aluminum core," said Patsalis. "Aluminum conducts heat, but if there is acid in a recipe, cooking in aluminum alone will impart a metallic taste to the finished dish.

"IF I have a class of 80 people, and ask how many are afraid of pressure cookers, 40 people will put up their hands. If I ask how many of them have never cooked with a pressure cooker, the same 40 will show their hands," said Patsalis.

An enthusiastic alumna of Patsalis' class is Shirley Nachman of Southfield.

"I put an egg in his top pocket and smashed it. He threw something at me and missed. The whole staff got involved. Then the executive chef walked in. The next day we almost all got fired. We didn't because there would have been no one to work in the restaurant. It

taught me to be strictly professional at work."

Best experience as a chef. "I cooked for Ronald Reagan's second inauguration. The theme was Taste of the Nation. I prepared Michigan game sausages, venison, buffalo, pheasant and Traverse City cherry sausage."



Book helps you give your sweet tooth its just desserts

The adage that a picture is worth a thousand words is especially true when it's illustrating a complicated

The Good Housekeeping Illustrated Book of Desserts, edited by Mildred Ying, and published in fall 1991 by Hearst Books of William Morrow and Co. Inc. (\$25), uses pictures to make elaborate dessert-making

Also accompanying the recipes, are little tricks to make the desserts look good as well as taste good.

If pretty and imaginative desserts are your goal, this book has plenty of ideas. The recipe for Dreamy Chocolate Cake includes directions on how to make the grated chocolate curls to go along the edges of the completed cake. Cannoli Cake features instructions for making a feather design on the top.

The Creamy Rice Pudding recipe is topped off with a cinnamon lattice design. I tried this one out on guests at a party, and although I didn't get the lattice design as perfect as the picture, it was still impressive.

Double-Chocolate Mousse Cake. I was hesitant to try out new recipes on guests, but the picture was too pretty to resist. I had some trouble keeping the mousse in one piece when transferring it to the cake plate, but once it was glazed, it looked great. The trick is to put waxed paper between the cake and the serving plate to catch the glaze drippings. Once the glaze is set, trim off the messy edges. A whipped cream border along the edge makes

it look like a professional made it. Chocolate lovers will find many confections to their liking such as the Marbled Mousse, Individual Chocolate Souffles with coffee cream and the Chocolate Box with berries and cream that features directions on how to make a chocolate

In 4-quart saucepan over medium heat, heat milk and salt to simmering; stir in rice. Reduce heat to low; cover and simmer 45 to 50 minutes until rice is very tender and mixture is thick, stirring occasionally. Stir in raisins.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Grease 13-inch by 9-inch baking dish; set in large roasting pan.

In large bowl, with wire whisk or fork, beat sugar, vanilla extract, evaporated milk and eggs until blended; gradually stir in hot rice mixture

Place baking dish in pan on oven rack; carefully pour rice mixture into baking dish (mixture will almost fill dish). Fill roasting pan with boil-ing water to come halfway up sides of baking dish. Bake 40 to 45 minutes until knife inserted in center of pudding comes out clean.

Make cinnamon lattice on top of pudding. Hold ruler diagonally across 1 corner of baking dish, about 1 inch from edge of pudding. Holding cinnamon jar in other hand, evenly shake spice through sprinkler hold along ruler edge. Shake excess spice off ruler. Repeat at 1-inch intervals Repeat in opposite direction to form lattice pattern.

To serve garnish pudding with cherries. Serve warm or refrigerate to serve cold later. Serves 16.







'Billy' gets a green light from ABC

in new series

By Suzanne Gill When "Head of the Class" needed a substitute for Howard Hesseman in its final season, producers Michael Elias and Rich Eustis hired Scotsman Billy Connolly to mentor the misfits of academe.

At the time, Connolly was gaining a national reputation as a funny but foul-mouthed stand-up comedian. but fortunately for Elias and Eustis, he was much more - an experienced musician, writer and comic actor with credits stretching from the Scottish Opera to the West End. When "Class" ended its run last spring, the producers dismissed their younger stars and hung on to Connolly.

And so "Billy" landed on cat feet in the ABC Friday-night schedule two weeks ago, marking the start of a particularly strong-looking spring season for the network. With some fanfare but very little hype, the series slipped unpretentiously into the schedule.

It is the kind of series that belies

Connolly starts fresh "formula" for success in situation comedy. The premise, about a marriage of convenience between a struggling single mom and a college professor in need of a green card, is contrived, unoriginal and even illegal. None of that mattered to its test audiences, nor does it matter on the home screen.

> Everything about "Billy" looks "broken in" and comfortable. The cast looks at home on the set, the set isn't a distraction and the story lines jump right into the middle of the family's life, without self-conscious exposition. Add to this Connolly's occasional ad libs, and "Billy" has an unforced spontaneity that's truly

"The qualities that are written for me in the show just suit me lovely," says Connolly in his native burr. Though his character, Billy MacGregor, is technically married to divorcee Mary Springer (daytime drama veteran Marie Marshall), she considers him a boarder. Her children, a teenage boy (Johnny Galecki) and two younger girls (Clara Bryant and Natanya Ross). accept him as a sort of black-sheep uncle. Connolly especially likes the give-and-take between his character and Galecki's 14-year-old David.

"I like the way MacGregor handles the situations, especially with David. Little kids are easier to get along with, but you can't pull the wool over his eyes at all. So that's a bit I really enjoy.'

The head of an off-screen household that includes five children between 2 and 20, Connolly downplays his experience at parenting.

"I'm not one of those guys you see in commercials fawning fatherly on their children. But I'm a pretty good monster from time to time; you know, growling behind you up the stairs and all that.

"I have a kind of Victorian side, (too), and I say, 'Where are you going? Where have you been?""

As for the expletives, he's managed to delete them from his television persona because, he says, he accepts the "parameters" of the

When the subject is modern history, the question is, "Where were you when Kennedy was shot in 1963?"

When the subject is space exploration, the question is, "Where were you when Neil Armstrong stepped foot on the moon in 1969?"

CBS, which has not covered a Winter Olympics since Squaw Valley in 1960. has dispatched an army of news and sports personnel to cover these Games. offering 116 hours of coverage over 17 days. The network has sold an additional 50 hours of weekday coverage to TNT, marking the first time an Olympics has been carried on cable

Anchoring CBS' prime-time coverage of the Games are Paula Zahn and Tim McCarver. Highlights of the evening coverage will include a pre-Olympics special on Thursday, Feb. 6. the opening ceremonies on Saturday, Feb. 8, a variety of skiing and skating events, including pairs figure skating

on Tuesday, Feb. 11, and ice dancing finals on Monday, Feb. 17.

Coverage begins each weekday during the CBS Morning News, with Harry Smith and Greg Gumbel at the International Broadcast Center in Moutiers. France Live events during these hours will include ice hockey. alpine skiing, speed skating and biathlon. In addition, half-hour wrap-up shows will air each weekday at noon (Eastern time) and once again after the late news. Correspondent Pat O'Brien anchors the late-night show, while announcer James Brown holds forth at

Reporting and feature stories will be done by CBS stalwarts Mike Wallace and Morley Safer, Charles Kuralt and Charles Osgood, Andy Rooney, John Madden and former Olympic gold medalist Scott Hamilton. 


