## Law defends sewer project, denies conflict

Who would you rather have fixing your water and sewer rates — Gerry Law and local trustees or Coleman Young and the Detroit City Council?

That's one way to look at Plymouth Township's latest salvo against charges last month that the Western Townships Utilities Authority project — formed with Canton and Northville townships — would eventually result in big rate increases for local residents.

Township Supervisor Gerald Law defended the project and attacked critics in the recent township newsletter, and at the Tuesday trustees meeting. He also unveiled a state Bar of Michigan rule that says it's OK for Law's brother to be a partner in the law firm that represents the township and does work for the utilities authority. Law obtained the opinion in May.

During a public comment portion of the meeting, Mike Stankov of Plymouth told the board the sewer numbers are confusing but that it's a good project.

It's a good way for us to break away from the Wayne County power structure," he said, but added that the "cronyism has put a cloud over the project. That's the perception we have to deal with."

Law told Stankov and about a dozen others he plans on meeting with the WTUA board to discuss those perceptions.

Apart from Law's brother, charges of nepotism have centered on the role played by Abe Muntahk, a Plymouth Township trustee, who is vice president for an engineering firm that designed the sewer project and John Breen, the brother of former Plymouth Township supervisor Maurice Breen, who worked on property buying for the project.

The western townships authority was formed "to avoid the huge rate increases that are imminent for communities that rely on the current Detroit sewer system," Law said.

But the action "angered powerful individuals in Detroit," he continued.

Township to the Detroit system, which has had a long history of mismanagement, escalating costs, outdated treatment techniques and grossly inadequate capacity."

Further, the costs of the WTUA project are on time and on budget, according to township auditor Plante & Moran, a prominent government accounting firm.

When our WTUA project is completed, non-WTUA communities in Wayne County will still be polluting the Rouge, the Detroit River and the Great Lakes," Law said.

They will also begin to experience the impact of the cost of correcting these problems, currently estimated to be \$2.7 billion."

Township officials maintain that higher charges to Detroit system users could result, after the courts or another government entity possibly acts to force the Detroit system to construct overflow basins to keep raw sewage from running into rivers during severe storms. This happens routinely, as that system has relatively low capacity.

## Fire department talks rekindled

First they're on, then off.  
And now they're back on.

Talks on merging the city and township fire departments have resumed, as representatives of both employee unions and the city and township have met once and plan to meet again.

"The four parties to the issue are now talking together for the first time, that's a positive step," Plymouth city manager Steve Walters said.

The township presented a proposal on how the township fire department would bring in city fire department employees. Walters said the city fire fighters union is reviewing the proposal.

"I expect that within a week the city union will get back to the city committee (on shared services) with a response to the township," Walters said.

"Plymouth Township will hire all existing city captains, firefighters and the fire chief. The township would also acquire and own all city-owned fire apparatus."

For the city, "There is \$300,000 to \$400,000 to save by operating jointly," Walters said. The fire station at city hall would close, as the fire station at township hall — about a mile away — would cover the east central portion of the city.

Officials said savings to the township would be far less than savings to the city, but a merging of the two

## Trustee mulls run for supervisor slot

"I will not be able to make a decision until after the weekend," Stewart said Tuesday, adding he's considered running for the post. Stewart has taken out petitions to seek township office, as has Kathleen McCarthy, defeated by Law in the 1990 state representative Republican primary.

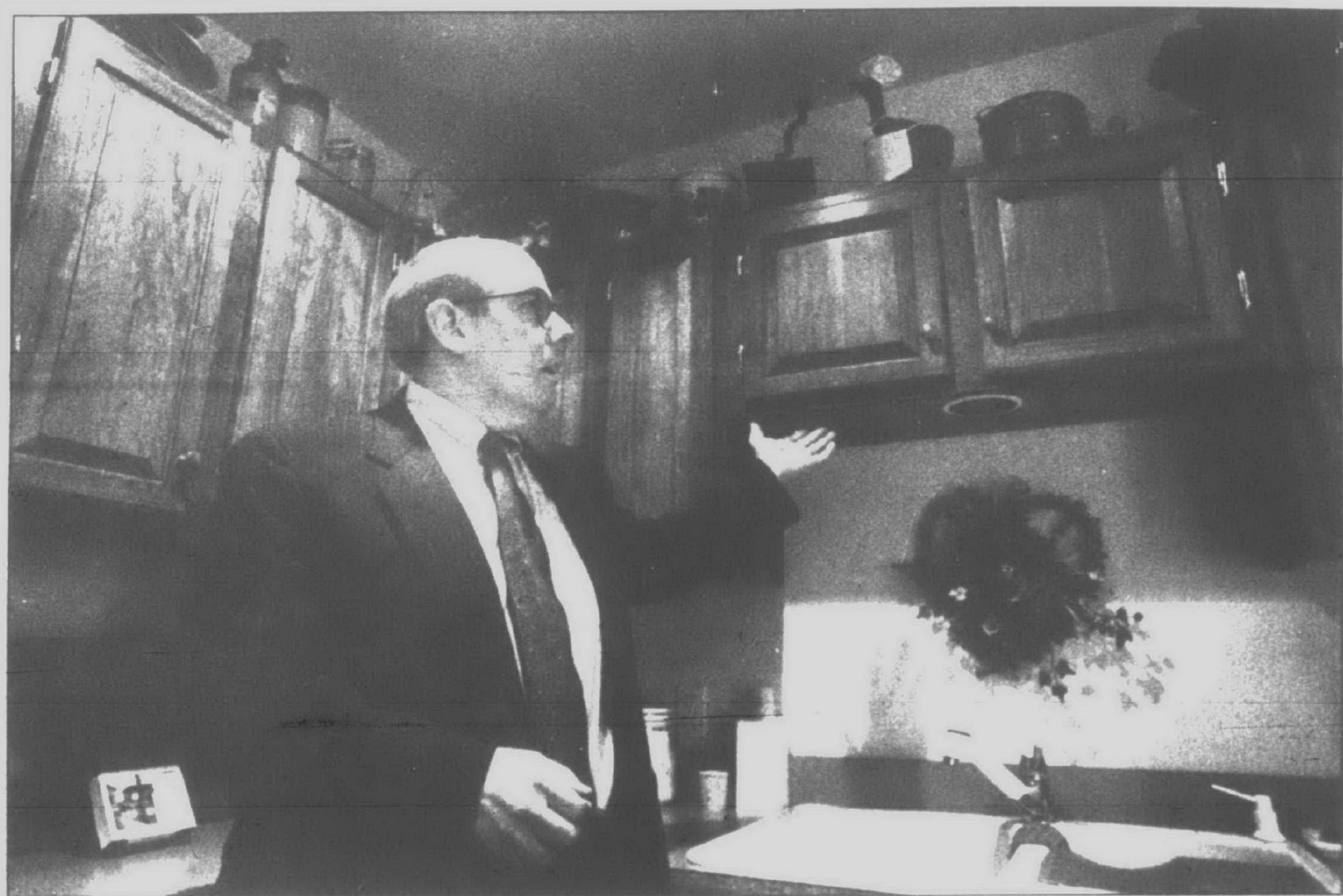
McCarthy has not ruled out a possible run for supervisor. Law has yet to take out petitions to seek the supervisor's post.

The deadline for submitting petitions is May 12. A primary election is scheduled for August, the general

## Finance director carves own niche

Bill Graham is Plymouth's finance director, a former acting city manager and banker, and has also served as a Canton trustee.

But a reporter was recently surprised to learn on recent trip to 35th District Court in Plymouth — on a story assignment — that Graham is also an accomplished woodworker. He built the eight benches placed in the halls outside courtrooms.

Graham has also built display cases to house two judges' por-

traits, cabinets for the kitchen of the home he shares with wife Terri on Forest Street, tables and more all out of a backyard workshop.

He built that, too, and the garage next to it.

"I think everybody needs some kind of hobby," Graham explained.

GETTING INTO HIS workshop after a long day working with city budget figures is "therapy," he said.

"The rewards are very gratifying," he said.

Graham got into woodworking in 1974, while working for Detroit

Bank and Trust. That summer, he broke an ankle and was laid up for a while.

"My dad bought me a jig saw, I spent a lot of time making candle holders in my basement."

"I really enjoyed it, I really got interested in it," he said.

Upon returning to work, the bank ran a contest for employees. "One of the prizes I could win was a

table saw," he said.

He won the saw and "kept adding one piece after another."

His workshop is now equipped with an assortment of power tools. While the cost of such tools can add up, he's been able to get some used pieces of equipment a bit cheaper.

His shop includes a radial arm saw, band saw, small and large shapers to make raised panels on cabinet doors and a table saw.

"Most of what I like to do is cabinet work. I like the straight, clean lines of shaker furniture," he said.

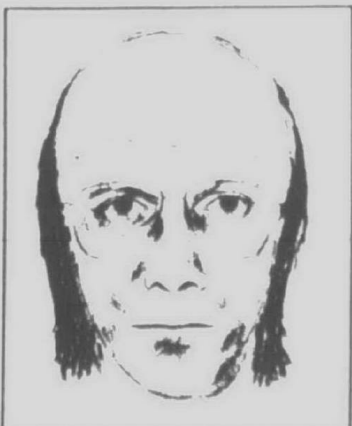

## Search continues for 'Zombie bandit'

Authorities are continuing their search for the "Zombie bandit," the bug-eyed bank robber who struck Canton and Plymouth banks and a dozen other cities.

Police and the FBI believe the robber, named because of his bulging eyes, has struck banks as far away as Indiana and Illinois since January. Apparently, he has traveled the I-94 corridor planning his crimes.

His most recent holdup was at a Comerica Bank in Sterling Heights last week, one day after a Canton bank robbery to which he is linked.

According to police reports, the bandit walked in to Mutual Savings Bank, 5844 Sheldon, about 2 p.m. March 3 and handed a note demanding money to a teller. The note ordered the teller to put cash from a drawer in a bag he was holding "or I'll start shooting."

He opened his coat to reveal the black handle of a pistol tucked in his pants' waistband. He fled the bank on foot with several thousand dollars. Witnesses did not see a car, police said.

THE ZOMBIE BANDIT is also linked to the Jan. 17 robbery of Heritage Federal Savings on Plymouth's

Main Street.

In that incident, police said the robber also produced a note demanding cash and showed the butt of a semi-automatic pistol in his waistband. He fled on foot, possibly to a waiting car.

According to the FBI, the bandit's string of robberies began Jan. 3 at a Southfield Manufacturers Bank. Other targets include:

A racist message left on the answering machine of a Plymouth business late Thursday or early Friday prompted the owners to alert police.

The message said "We do not serve niggers, Jews, Arabs and spics. We are a white supremacy company," the owners reported.

The owners, who changed the message, reported that it likely was left by someone using a code from a touch tone phone.

"I just want to f--- with police," he said, in front of the call dispatcher, according to the report police made on the incident.

After his arrest, the man later told police he had just been let out of the nut house, and "had gone off the wagon" as he had drank a quantity of vodka.

"Every year at city hall I make my staff their Christmas gifts," Graham said.

**ALONG ONE** wall of the workshop is 350 board feet of northern Michigan white pine. "Pine is my favorite because it is the most forgiving," he said. "I like cherry as a hard wood. I don't like oak, I have some kind of allergy to the dust."

Graham favors cherry because of its attractive grain and has also used it to build part of a fireplace mantle.

He's also built the housings for grandfather clocks and gave them to friends, but gave up building them when the actual clock mechanisms needed frequent repair — and he was often called on to make repairs.

For novice woodworkers thinking about getting serious, "The best advice I could give is spend the money to get the good tools. There's a lot of mediocre stuff that's out there in the marketplace," he said.

Hulsing students get first-hand look at old-fashioned learning

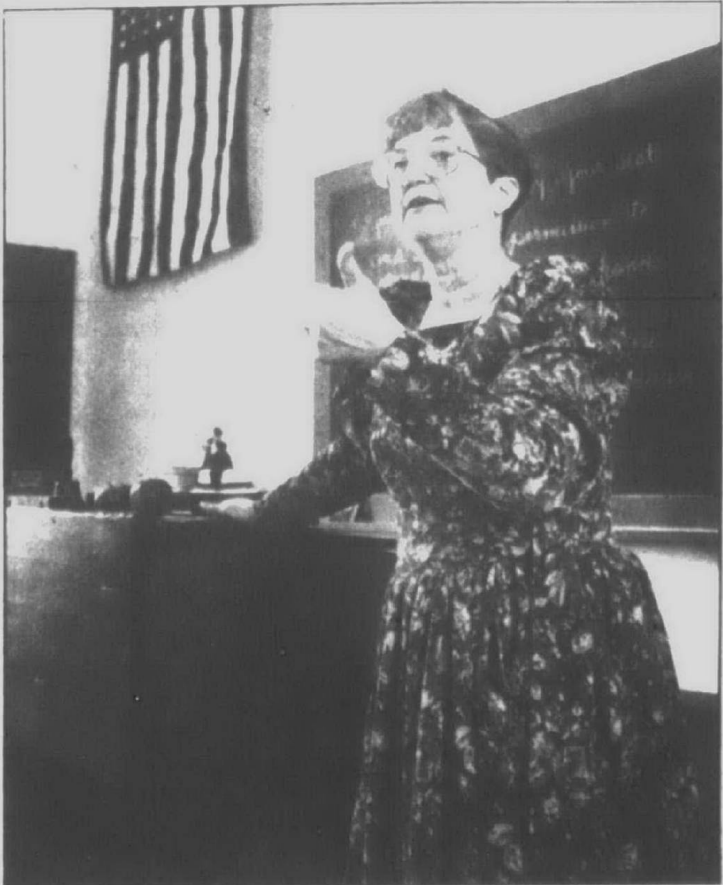
McClumpha's class was staying through Thursday at the school, as part of its study of Michigan history.

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

## Township fire department merger talks are on again

departments would mean the township would not have to hire and pay additional fire fighters to staff the recently completed third fire station serving the township's west end.

To merge the fire departments

would mean better fire coverage in the city, Walters said, as three fire stations would cover the city and freight trains crossing roadways would pose less interference in fire runs.

"The city more than the township

gets upgrading in the ability to respond to fire needs," he said.

The city would also be constantly served by six to seven full-time fire fighters, rather than two currently.

Also under the township proposal, city and township fire fighters would be administered under the township fire fighters union contract, with two exceptions: The contract paying the highest wage would determine wages for all fire fighters and captains, and city fire fighters could choose between the city or township pension program.

Under financial provisions of the proposal, a minimum of 25 percent of the cost of operating a joint fire department would be fall to the city.

## 9 in running for board

Forget Bush, Buchanan, Brown, Clinton and Tsongas. In Canton, local politicians are preparing to campaign. They have names like Tyree, Panos, Cleaver and Phillips. True, they are not household names, but the most successful among them will appear on the November ballot with the big guys.

So far, nine residents are interested in four board of trustee seats, and three in the treasurer job. Supervisor Tom Yack is unopposed.

"I'm sure there's still people out there who are planning to run but who I don't know about," said Clerk Loren Bennett, who oversees the election process and is also seeking re-election. Candidates must gather 128 valid signatures on nominating petitions. Supervisor, clerk and treasurer are full-time salaried positions. Trustee is a part-time job.

ALL ARE PARTISAN offices. The primary for local offices is Aug. 4, the general election Nov. 4.

Bennett said interest among potential candidates this year is about equal to four years ago. "Right now, what

we have, in my opinion, is comparable to (the election of) 1988," said Bennett. There is plenty of time left. The deadline for filing petitions is May 12.

One of the more interesting election year rumors has Jim Poole, Canton's outspoken former supervisor, challenging Tom Yack, who defeated Poole four years ago.

When queried this week, Poole said he didn't want to discuss the subject. But he offered a few hints.

"I've been out of politics four years and my blood pressure is normal," he said.

Here's a breakdown of candidates and potential candidates:

• Supervisor: Yack, 43850 Brandywyne, has obtained petitions and has several thousand dollars available for a campaign.

• Clerk: Bennett, 3226 Denton, has filed his nominating petitions. No one else has expressed interest in that office.

• Treasurer: This seat is open with the retirement of Gerald Brown. Elaine Kirchner, 48377 Gyde, now a township trustee, filed petitions for the job. Four others have obtained forms: John Cleaver, 43918 Southampton; Patrick Haggerty, 6265 Porteridge, a Plymouth accountant, and Tim McCurley, 49290 Geddes.

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# SMART unions accept wage freeze

Unions at the Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation (SMART) have agreed to a 1992 wage freeze to save some 600 jobs.

The announcement was made Tuesday by Michael Duggan, interim general manager of SMART, Matt Wirgau, board chairman, and union officials.

According to SMART officials the

wage freeze will save the Authority nearly \$500,000.

Union officials said "the wage freeze was agreed to as part of efforts to assist the Authority in achieving cost savings that will permit the continuation of transportation services."

SMART is currently faced with a

\$12 million deficit and layoff notices were set to go out on March 27.

A budget-cutting plan to save SMART is expected to be unveiled Thursday, Duggan said.

While pursuing a merger with the Detroit Department of Transportation, SMART officials are going over their budget "line by line" to keep the troubled Suburban Mobility Au-

thority for Regional Transportation open.

"All I can tell you is that everybody's working day and night," Duggan said.

Over 600 layoff notices would be rescinded if a rescue plan could be adopted, though Duggan offered no promises.

## Kosteva explains vote on early retirement bill

State Rep. Jim Kosteva, D-Canton, said he voted against a House-passed bill that would allow state employees whose age and years of service to retire early with full-pension benefits because the plan would be too costly for the state.

"When House Bill 5353 came up in the House last week, I had to break with the Democratic leadership and other members of the majority caucus in voting against it," Kosteva said. "I am not convinced that allowing some employees to take a fully-funded, early retirement would create real savings to the state."

"Under this bill, an employee whose age and years of state service add up to 70 would be eligible for early retirement. There would be an 'incentive' of five free years of service credit to certain employees who retire during a 'window' of time between October, 1991 and April, 1992. And, the bill would establish a universal 'buy-in,' which would allow an employee to purchase up to five years worth of service credit, to add to their retirement benefits and qualify for the early-out program."

"But the success of any early re-

tirement plan is based on the savings produced in the payroll reduction due to vacated positions. Like other early retirement plans, this bill bases its savings on 50 percent of the positions vacated by early retirements being filled by younger, less expensive workers. However, there has never been a systematic tracking of state hiring to make sure that positions are not filled at a higher rate. That means that the costs of an early retirement plan show up in the state budget, but the savings can't be found.

"We're still paying for the 1984 early-out scheme to the tune of \$8.25 million per year. The cost of the five-year incentive in this bill could total about \$100 million for the approximately 1,500 people. Even spread out over a 30-year amortization period, it is still an alarming amount of state dollars to benefit relatively few state workers. We would be mortgaging future budgets for a plan that may or may not work."

The bill passed by the House faces an uncertain future in the Senate.

Visitors may observe the competition, take pictures and interview the students. All students have already distinguished themselves as the top spellers at their schools.

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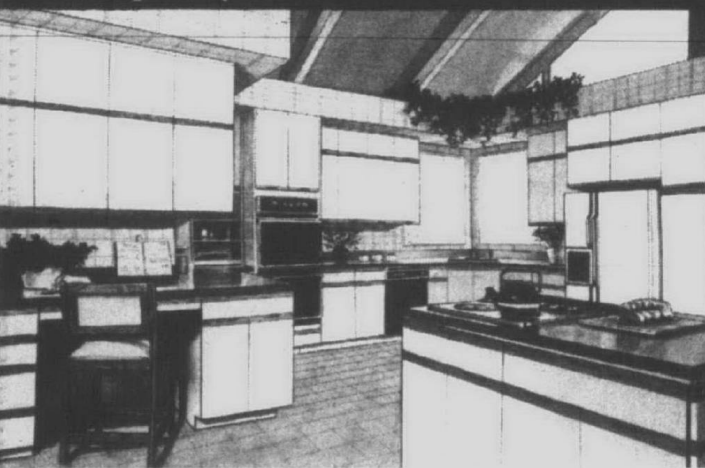
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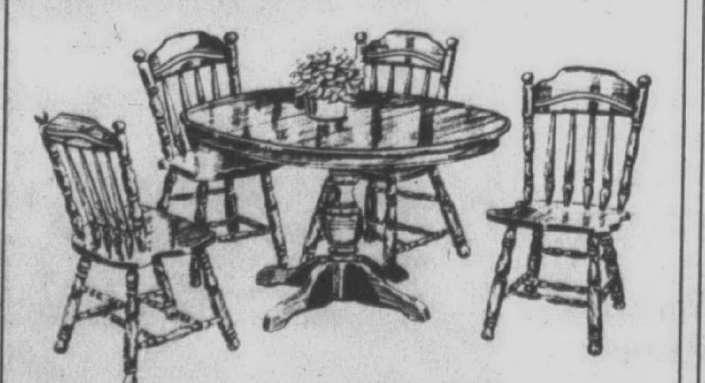
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## MHS seeks card designs

## No-pest laws stripped from locals

The state would prohibit local pesticide ordinances under a bill passed 28-10 by the state Senate last week and sent to the House.

Opponents lost an effort to tie the bill to forthcoming rules from the state Agriculture Department that will govern public notices about pesticide use.

"Think what it means to children," said opponent Lana Pollack, D-Ann Arbor. "Is your school spraying too often?" she said, raising her eyes to school children in the Senate gallery. "Do your parents know?"

BUT SPONSOR Nick Smith, R-Addison, said, "Although I believe that local units of government should have the authority to solve local concerns, there are some laws that should be uniform in the state."

Smith said the bill, sent back to his Agriculture Committee last month, allows some local control. "Gener-

ally, the legislation would pre-empt local units of government from enacting any pesticide ordinance. Exceptions can be made when the need arises to address unique local circumstances where unreasonable adverse effects on public health or the environment may result," he said.

"Local units of government can pass an ordinance and send it to the director of the Agriculture Department, who would have 90 days to veto the measure. If no action is taken, the local ordinance would go into effect."

A handful of people from Milford,

Troy and Grand Rapids fought the bill, arguing they or their children were poisoned by pesticides and held virtual prisoners in their homes when pesticides were in use. They asked for local ordinances requiring notices of spraying, particularly in public buildings.

Their cause was picked up by the Michigan Municipal League, which represents cities and villages, citing the "home rule" argument.

THE FARM Bureau and chemical industry sought the pre-emption bill after the U.S. Supreme Court in mid-1991 upheld local pesticide ordi-

nances in the village of Milford and a Wisconsin county.

Voting yes on the Smith bill were: William Faust, D-Westland, Robert Geake, R-Northville, and George Z. Hart, D-Dearborn.

Voting no were Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham, Mat Dunaskiss, R-Oxford, Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, and David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield.

Pollack offered an amendment to tie the bill to Agriculture Department posting rules, which have been worked on for years and are nearing completion. Her amendment got only 15 yes votes, with 20 needed for passage. Faxon, Hart and Honigman supported it.

Backing Pollack, Sen. John Cherry, D-Clio, said, "To subject the agriculture community to a multiplicity of regulations might be an impossibility. But we have urban communities where state law isn't adequate. If the (Agriculture Department) rules were in place, I wouldn't be so concerned."



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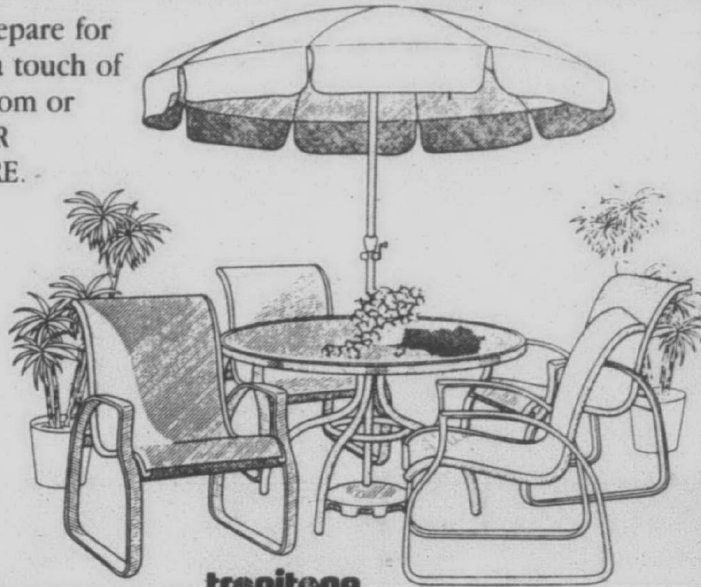

"On Golden Pond" isn't the most typical community theater production, and that's just fine with Dean Acheson.

PTG members had several reasons for choosing "On Golden Pond," said Acheson, who directs productions and teaches theater at Roeper School in Birmingham.

"One, it's fresh. Not a lot of theaters have done it."

THE PLAY, the third in the current PTG season, is a love story focusing on an older couple, retired professor Norman Thayer and his wife, Ethel, as they return to their summer home on Golden Pond for the 44th year.

Their daughter, Chelsea, and her boyfriend stop by to drop off his teenage son to be watched by the Thayers. The family members have their differences but learn to love and respect each other.

Roles in the 1981 movie were played by the late Henry Fonda, Katharine Hepburn and Jane Fonda. Local cast members aren't concerned about filling those shoes.

"People will come in looking for the movie, and it isn't the movie," Acheson said. The production benefits from being "the same as but different" from the movie.

"There's a name recognition on one level," he said. When they take to the stage, local performers won't be identical to the Fondas and Hepburn.

"I hope within moments they (play-goers) won't find them, but

To help provide that closeness, about 40 audience members will sit on the sides of the stage during each performance. Only a portion of the auditorium will be used for seating, so that all theater-goers will be relatively close to the actors.

"They'll eavesdrop." Watching the play will be somewhat like peeking in through a neighbor's side window, Acheson said.

The set is built to resemble a summer cabin, complete with plenty of exposed beams.

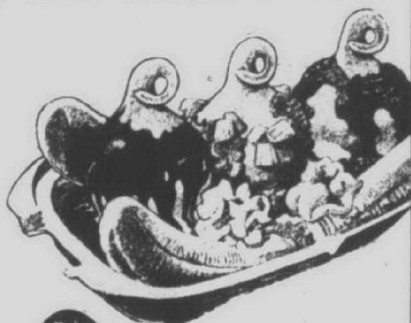

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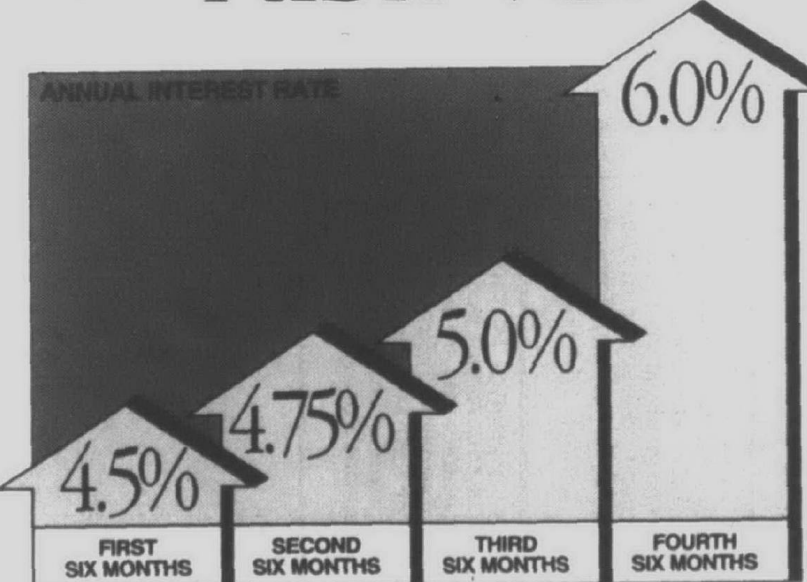
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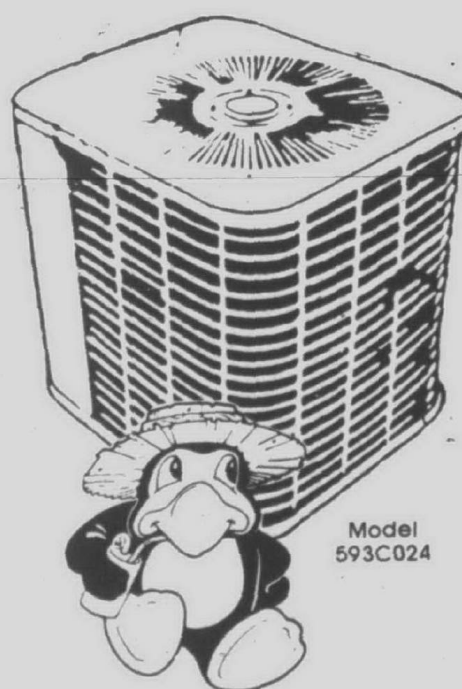

In the controversy over trade policy, discussion centers on both the short and the long range interests of the United States. It is estimated that one out of seven Americans has no health insurance. The cost of medical care continues to skyrocket, rising more than twice as fast as the Consumer Price Index in the last 10 years. I don't believe we can rely on the government to control costs, because government has never been as efficient as the private sector. This plan will not increase the deficit or national health spending.

Cost of health care has spiraled out of control and now threatens financial security of many Americans. But socialized medicine like British and Canadian systems would lead to radical decline in quality of care and rationing of services. We will support reforms like tax deductions for insurance premiums and deregulation to limit the power of cold-blooded bureaucracy that now dominates our health-care system and put as much power as possible back into the hands of individual doctors and patients, who will treat each other as human beings.

The comprehensive health care program I announced Feb. 6 is based on two principles. Helping those who cannot afford health insurance pay for it with a tax credit of up to \$3750, while at the same time building upon the strengths of America's health care system; namely, the freedom of individuals to choose physicians, hospitals and health plans. I've also proposed a set of malpractice reforms to help contain health care costs.

Low and middle income working people should have the same access to health care that welfare recipients have. Insurance reform would be the first step. I would allow 1) a federal income tax write-off to every uninsured person who purchases private insurance; 2) tax write-offs to private physicians who treat uninsured persons at no charge; 3) similar write-offs for hospitals, laboratories and clinics who provide free services.

Our federal government continues to spend more than it takes in. Hence, we have a rapidly escalating national debt which is now nearly \$4 trillion. The interest on this debt stands at over \$200 billion annually and is the second largest expenditure in the budget after defense. How can we reduce the deficit and, thus, the national debt and start using our financial resources for productive purposes rather than for paying interest?

More taxation is not the answer. We can reduce spending by streamlining the federal government. Right now we are paying for troops to defend Germany against a nonexistent enemy (the former U.S.S.R.). We can eliminate unnecessary waste and cut our defense budget by 50% without compromising our security. A 13% flat tax (on income and business value added) will eliminate tremendous bureaucracy and inefficiency in the IRS and result in fairer taxes for all.

Cut defense spending by over 1/3 by 1997, bringing cumulative savings of \$200 billion; more cuts by the decade's end if favorable world trends continue. Reinvest the "peace dividend" in future-oriented programs: education; training; child health; environmental technologies; basic research; infrastructure. Limit increases in the consumption budget to the rate of increase in personal income so the budget grows no faster than the economy, or the average American's ability to pay for it.

I have two key strategies to control the deficit. First, I would impose a budget freeze to limit total spending but allow shifting within categories. My 1984 bill to freeze the Federal budget passed the Senate and could have substantially reduced the deficit if it had been enacted. Second, I would commit savings from defense cutbacks to deficit reduction in addition to investment and human needs.

We will freeze federal spending, federal hiring and federal pay hikes. We will roll back the midnight congressional pay raise by 50%. And we will eliminate government waste by using the line item veto which we believe is in the Constitution. If Congress doesn't like it, they can take us to the Supreme Court. If the Supreme Court doesn't agree, we will take our case directly to the American people to change the law.

The most important thing is to cap the growth of uncontrolled government spending. In my State of the Union Address I challenged Congress to abide by enforceable spending limitations, and I proposed freezing total domestic discretionary spending as well as the number of non-defense federal employees. I also asked Congress to end 246 federal programs that can no longer be justified, saving almost \$5 billion in 1993 alone. I am seeking major reductions in 84 programs which would save another \$8.1 billion in 1993.

A President needs these tools to work with: 1) a line-item veto and a Balanced Budget Amendment; 2) down-sizing of the federal government to reduce expenses; 3) tax reform to encourage the growth of the private sector, which will bring in more federal revenues and 4) finally, monetary reform.

Many Americans feel that there are severe environmental problems that need to be addressed in a comprehensive way. Some of these problems are toxic and hazardous wastes, solid waste, over-population, air and water pollution, and energy management. Name two or three specific ways you as president would provide leadership to deal with any or all of these concerns.

When I was Governor, California became the world leader in the development of non-polluting alternative energy sources such as solar and wind power. In America, there is a tremendous efficiency possible in electric and fuel efficient cars and in retrofitting homes and factories. And when we save fuel, we save money and help the environment by polluting less. Finally, we need a true commitment from the federal government to clean up toxic waste sites.

To fight global warming and ozone depletion, we must agree to an international set of goals to achieve 1990 levels of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions by the year 2000; and a greater reduction in CO<sub>2</sub> emissions may well be attainable. We need a national energy efficiency strategy, including European standards of energy efficiency in factories and office buildings, that uses revenue-neutral market incentives to reward consumers who conserve and makes polluters and energy wasters pay.

I would stress an energy policy that emphasizes energy efficiency and renewable resources. In the Senate, I wrote the legislation creating the Solar and Conservation Bank, and secured funding for research and development. These policies are critical to many environmental threats, including global warming. I would also take a leadership role in preserving wilderness areas. I was the principal architect of the Alaska Lands Act which preserved 104 million acres of Alaskan wilderness.

We all want to preserve America's natural beauty. But environmentalism, sometimes based on false science, is now threatening the American way of life by threatening our ability to create jobs. Now that we have saved the Spotted Owl, what are we going to do for the American worker? We will impose a two-year moratorium on new federal regulations and review and roll back many of those imposed by Mr. Bush in the last three years.

My administration has achieved historic progress toward a cleaner environment. Our accomplishments and continuing priorities include the strongest clean air laws in the world, an innovative and revitalized EPA, record-breaking law enforcement, accelerated cleanup of toxic waste sites, improved coastal stewardship, an eventual end to the net loss of wetlands, more efficient energy technologies, and increased international cooperation on problems like the ozone layer and pollution cleanup in developing countries.

a) Technology is the only lasting solution to the problem of toxic and hazardous waste disposal. On-site disposal of the toxic wastes through bio-remediation, solidification and other emerging new technologies would be encouraged. b) Current environmental laws are to be enforced to the fullest extent of the law. c) I would steer America away from Persian Gulf oil brought to our shores in super tankers and develop domestic oil resources, as well as oil from Mexico and Venezuela.

## Cable TV Hearings key to agreements

**T**HE REMOTE control clicker for our television sets gives us an illusion of power. We sit there clicking away, trying to find something to watch. So many cable channels, but so little to watch.

Well, it's time to put down the clicker and take control. Plymouth Township and the city of Plymouth are holding hearings on cable TV at which residents can air their complaints.

Plymouth Township's hearing is at 7 p.m. today, with the city of Plymouth holding its hearing at 7 p.m. on Monday, March 23. Canton has yet to schedule a hearing.

The importance of the hearings can be summed up in one word: monopoly. Omnicom has one in Plymouth, Canton and Northville.

**BUT THERE** is a catch. It's called a franchise renewal, and Omnicom must negotiate new con-

tracts with the three communities.

Those contracts are coming up in the three communities. That's why attending the hearings is important. It's the strategic time for voices to be heard.

When those new contracts are negotiated, the same outside consultant will be hired to do the work. While the exact cost of hiring the consultant isn't known yet, it makes sense. The communities have more clout if they stand together.

On the subject of cost. It appears that the cost of hiring a consultant could be paid from the franchise fees paid to the communities by Omnicom.

But while the consultants will be handling the high-tech questions, there's plenty of room for concerns from residents.

That's why the hearings are important. Timing is everything.

## Cable fare Meetings should be on menu

**W**HILE LOCAL governmental units are negotiating with Omnicom Cablevision for a new franchise agreement (see related editorial), it's time those bodies turn the eye on themselves.

By the eye, we mean the television camera. Only Canton Township's meetings are broadcast on cable. It's time for the city of Plymouth, Plymouth Township and the Plymouth Canton schools to get up to speed with the 1990s.

The broadcasting of public meetings is a way for residents to keep tabs on what's going on without having to attend each meeting. Also, it enables residents to use their VCRs to tape the comments of their elected officials.

It's a scary notion, if you're a politician or a public official. Video tapes can come back to haunt. Just ask the Los Angeles police department.

THE SERVICE is available from Omnicom.

General manager Lisa Boland recently wrote letters to government leaders, letting them know cable TV coverage of government meetings is free.

Boland said that if a community wants to televise meetings, all it needs to find is two volunteers to film the meetings.

She sent the letter three weeks ago. "I wanted to make sure all the communities were aware of the opportunities through Omnicom," she said.

"The equipment is available and free to use; we train any interested party that would like to tape these meetings," she said.

Boland said that once a community identifies two volunteers, training sessions can be scheduled.

It's time for the schools, the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township to make participation in government more accessible to the public. It's time to take to the airwaves, or should we say cablewaves?

## Ban it School is no place to smoke

**O**F THE MANY subjects taught throughout our school systems, smoking should stay in a class by itself — and not be allowed.

At issue are the rights of a minor to smoke versus the bombardment of common sense and factual evidence that tell us, repeatedly, of the harm caused by cigarette smoke. Even though the most committed smoker will candidly admit smoking is a bad policy for good health, that message battles daily with cigarette advertising and thus remains difficult to convey.

Adding to the difficulty are the examples we set in front of our students. It is, and should be, an adult's right to smoke if he or she so chooses. Not only that — that adult has the right to smoke without being badgered by self-appointed moralists who make it their business to police the actions of others.

It is bad judgment, though, to preach the ills of smoking and then head to the teachers' lounge for a cigarette between classes.

**IN THE WEST** Bloomfield schools, the administration is involved in an interesting little grievance. The administration would like school buildings, during, before and after classes, to be smoke-free.

However, the teachers' union has a clause in its contract that says the administration must provide a smoking lounge for teachers.

A couple months ago there were several stories about the impact Camel cigarette ads had on young people. Opponents of the ads said teenagers found the ads appealing and sought to mimic the lifestyle portrayed in the ads — which showed Joe Camel dressed to the nines, having the kind of fun we'd all like to have. The only difference was that he had — what else — a Camel cigarette in his mouth or hand.

When our reporters asked students at the high school if they were susceptible to such advertising, responses varied. However, most of the students did mention they thought it ironic that they were asked not to smoke while smoke was billowing out of the teacher's lounge.

**IN THE PLYMOUTH-CANTON** schools, a similar conflict is brewing. Although there are rules against students smoking, those policies are largely unenforced. Students, and teachers, smoke outside the school buildings (Canton and Salem) which combine to give the campus more

of a college, rather than high school, setting.

The administration has proposed banning smoking in, at or around the schools. The students, of course, feel what they do on their own time is their own business. But the same issue is at hand — asking students not to do something decidedly bad, but then turning around and doing it yourself.

The days of sneaking into the john for a smoke between classes, and more often than not finding the assistant principal in there catching a quick smoke between meetings (or worse — bumming cigarettes from students) are over.

It's a difficult issue. Teachers have rights, too, and those rights don't necessarily start and stop at the school perimeter. Worse, suppose a teacher wants to have a glass of beer and is seen, on his or her own time, entering a local bar. Some would make that teacher the object of scorn for preaching the ills of alcohol in class and then having a beer later.

There are two important differences operating here, though, that should be noted and not forgotten.

**FIRST, AND PERHAPS** foremost, despite what some students may think, teachers are adults. The law says anyone over 18 years of age can smoke, and anyone under 18 can't. That's that.

Once upon a time, the drinking age in Michigan was lowered to 18. It was then raised again to 21. Whether the drop to 18 was a wise move depends on whom you ask. The point, though, is that a lot of young people lobbied for the lower drinking age. Instead of grumbling about it, students could lobby to change the law regarding when they legally can smoke.

Second: Teachers who may want a beer don't stroll into class drinking one, or stand around outside school with a cold one. If they did, they would be considered irresponsible, among other things.

What makes smoking outside (or inside) school any different?



## March primary previews economic driving forces

**GENERAL MOTORS'** decision to close its Willow Run plant previewed the earthquake that will rock Michigan's political economy for the rest of this century.

Like the juddering shifts between great plates in the earth's crust, the fundamental relationships between Michigan's most powerful (and least adaptable) institutional forces — the automobile industry and organized labor — are coming into painful realignment.

The driving forces are clear. For the auto industry, poor product quality and design, bad management and market share lost to skillful foreign competition drove the Big Three to report last month the largest collective annual loss in history.

For workers, declining productivity, poor skills and wholesale exports of manufacturing jobs, coupled with a persistent and severe recession, have driven average Michigan family incomes down for the first time in modern times.

The American dream is close to turning into Michigan's Nightmare.

**FORD AND** Chrysler saw the writing on the wall during the 1980s, slashed costs, downsized capacity, striving for a collaborative relationship with the UAW.

By contrast, history is likely to say that Roger Smith's tenure at GM was a disaster. Instead of rethinking the basics, GM went on a \$6 billion high technology spending spree that

wasted both precious time and money.

Now GM is literally out of cash. And although Bob Stempel is finally biting the bullet of costs and capacity, he has no time to bring along the UAW without a fight.

GM's decision to close Willow Run in favor of Arlington, Texas, where workers are willing to work three shifts around the clock without overtime, is nothing more than an ultimatum to the UAW: We'll do what we have to do — with or without you.

This is a fundamental shift in the ways management and labor have done things in the auto industry for the past 40 years.

**THE UAW** also is between a rock and a hard place.

The rock is the poor health of the domestic auto industry and the peril at GM. The hard place is that the entire UAW leadership is up for re-election this summer, and in this intensely political union, taking steps with management is a recipe for big trouble.

A UAW member at Arlington was quoted last week as saying that his Michigan brothers and sisters had to learn that GM is in business to make a profit, not to provide stable, high paying jobs for union members. Senior leaders at the UAW know this perfectly well, but acknowledging it courts disaster.

Solidarity House for years has made sure local unions toe the line

on bargaining. But when GM cuts a deal with a local union in Texas — trading concessions for keeping a plant open — old notions of central union control go out the window.

**SO, LIKE** the rocks on either side of a fault line, neither GM nor the UAW has much room to maneuver.

The traditional ways in which management and labor have managed their relationships — in flexibility, in wages and fringes, in training and productivity, in collaboration — are now all under intense pressure for change. The combination of angry and scared workers and an industry in crisis assure that change will come.

How this pressure will express itself and how public policy adapts will be the fundamental issues of Michigan's political economy for the rest of the decade. The first hint of how the political system responds will come next week in the March 17 Michigan primary election.

## Let's 'tax' more speeders

A LOCAL columnist was grouching the other day about police pulling "poor slob" over and giving them speeding tickets to, as he put it, "raise money to support a bloated court system, not to enforce the law."

I read it and shrugged it off as just another opinion that I didn't particularly agree with. But then, that's what an opinion page is for — to offer a diversity of opinions.

"Anyway," I said to a colleague, "he probably got a speeding ticket on the way to work."

Then on Sunday I picked up a copy of the *Siamese Newspaper* — you know, the *Free News* or the *New Free* or whatever it is — and there on Page 1 was a story: "Cops bedevil speed demons."

On the surface it was a legitimate story about police — both state and local — cracking down on speeders on Metro Detroit freeways. But the second and third sentences told the real story: "Suburban and state police say they're taking a tougher stance against speeders to save lives. But speed traps also raise much-needed revenue for local communities."

The story included a color map pinpointing spots where police frequently set up radar speed traps. The locator map (as it's known in newspaper parlance) included locations on I-75 in Troy, the Lodge in Southfield and I-96 in Livonia.

In other words, here's where they're hiding, buddy, so you'd better watch out. This message has been brought to you as a public service.

**SPEED TRAPS.** The phrase con-

jures up images of a good ole southern sheriff, parking his patrol car or motorcycle behind a billboard and nailing some tourist for doing 36 in a 35 mph speed zone.

Such scenes used to be common, and I imagine they still are in some spots. The "victim" is hauled into the sheriff's office where he's ordered to pay a huge fine or spend some time in the local jail. Those are speed traps.

But get on a Metro Detroit freeway and talk to me about speed traps. You're tooling along at 65 mph — 10 miles over the limit — and most of the traffic is zooming past you like you were backing up. And don't be surprised if one of those speedsters either leans on the horn,

makes an obscene gesture or at least gives you a dirty look.

Speed traps? So what? You've got to be going a good 20 to 30 mph over the limit before a cop is even going to bother with you. So you're doing 80 in a 55 mph zone and you get a ticket. That doesn't make you a victim, not in my book.

**THE PROBLEM** is that many people who weep and wail about getting drunk drivers off the roads draw the line when it comes to stupid drivers. That's getting too personal.

Now I am NOT defending drunk driving. But when a person has too much to drink, climbs behind the wheel of a car and drives like a... well, like a drunk... the drunkenness at least offers an explanation for his behavior. Not an excuse, mind you, but an explanation.

But there's no explaining the jerk who is stone-cold sober and still drives like a maniac. He should be nailed, hit with a stiff fine and get points on his record. There's nothing so sympathetic about him.

If fines like that put a little extra money into some suburban coffers, so what? There's nothing wrong with "taxing" the violators — if you want to view those fines as a tax — instead of raising the gasoline or some other tax for everybody — the poor slob who abide by the law as well as those who violate it.

Speed traps? I wish there were more of them.

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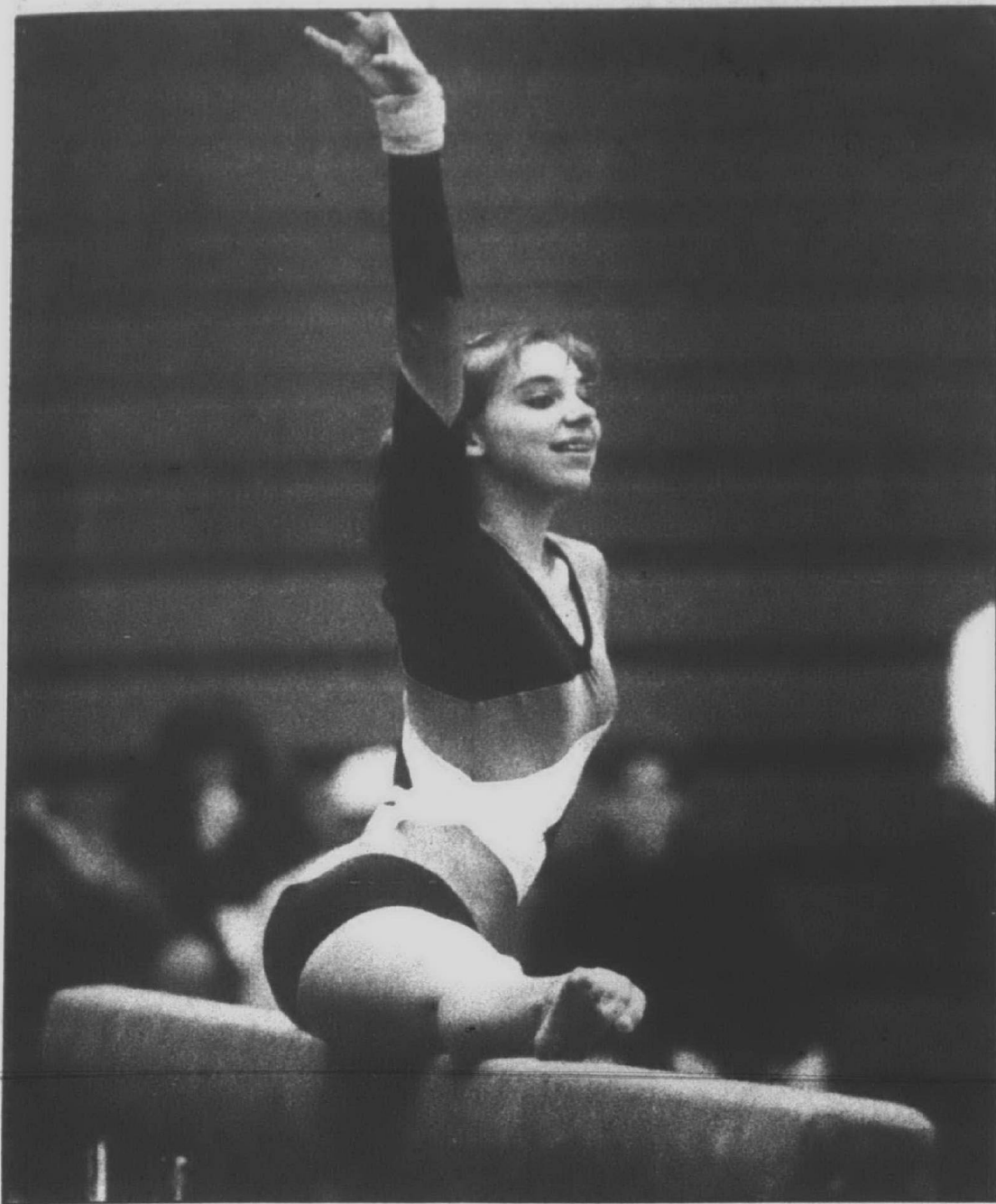

With the regional meet producing the expected results Saturday, the teams will now focus on the season's culminating event — the state championships.

The finals in team and all-around competition will take place Friday, beginning at 3:30 p.m. in the Trenton High School gym. The champions in each individual event will be determined Saturday afternoon at the same site.

Being the Nos. 1 and 3 teams in the state most of the season, Salem and Canton were heavy favorites to finish first and second in the regional, respectively.

And they did, with the top-ranked Rocks winning their second consecutive title with a 145.2 score. The Chiefs had a 142.1 total, and Westland John Glenn was the third qualifier at 135.6.

SALEM WAS the state runner-up behind No. 2 Muskegon Mona Shores last year and will get its toughest competition from the Sailors, who were rated No. 1 until the Rocks finished ahead of them at the Midland Invitational.

"It has been a goal for (the Salem girls) all year, and I think that would be a great accomplishment for the school," said first-year coach Becky Martin of a possible state title for the Rocks.

"If we're on, we'll do well. I want them to be confident in what they're doing and to do their best. I think we have a good chance."

### gymnastics

Salem will have to compete without one of its best gymnasts, sophomore Alycia Sofios, who has the area's top all-around score but is sidelined with a case of mononucleosis and had to miss the regional meet.

"Not having Alycia makes it harder," Martin said. "It does put pressure on everyone else, but I think our team is strong enough. That's the one advantage of having a team with a lot of depth. If one person is out, our team can pick it up."

"What's going to hurt us is bars, because Alycia is our top scorer on bars. In the other events, we will be pretty strong. But even on bars, if everyone else is on, I think we should do well there, too."

CANTON WAS third in the state last year, and the Chiefs should finish there again, barring any late-season improvement by some teams that could challenge Canton.

Rochester Adams, Rochester and Bloomfield Hills Lahser were the top three teams (in that order) at the Fraser regional while Freeland, East Lansing, Holt, Mona Shores, Traverse City and Holland qualified at two out-state sites.

"It's the same situation we faced last year," Canton coach John Cunningham said, meaning the Chiefs are more likely to move down a notch than up.

"It'll be third place at best, but we have solid performers and I'm confident we'll do well. I've got kids who

have experience in competition, and I don't have to worry about them being rattled.

"There are a couple 140 teams, and anybody that can score 140 will be in contention for third place. I expect our competition will come from Freeland and the three Fraser (regional) schools."

Salem had three of the top five all-arounders in the Canton regional — Courtney Gonyea was first, Melissa Hopson second and Sarah Makins third — and has the added plus of having at least five girls qualified in each event.

EACH TEAM competes four in each event at the state meet and must count all four scores. In Salem's situation, the Rocks can drop their lowest score in each event.

"It takes a little bit of the pressure off," Martin said.

An added twist this year is the distinction between Division I and II gymnasts. Anyone who has competed in club gymnastics the last two years is classified as Division I. The top eight in each regional event from both divisions qualified for state. All scores can count toward the team total regardless of division.

The top 10 girls in each event Friday will be eligible to compete for the individual state titles by division Saturday.

"Courtney or Melissa has a good chance at winning, depending on how everyone else does," said Martin of the Division I all-around title. "All of (the Salem girls) have a good chance at placing in at least one event."

Gonyea won the regional all-around title with a 37.25 total. Hop-

## CC rolls over Southfield in district tourney debut

Not winning the Catholic League basketball playoffs might have done Redford Catholic Central some good.

The Shamrocks, playing more inspired since losing to Dearborn Divine Child in last month's Catholic League playoff quarterfinal, routed Southfield 73-55 in Monday's Class A district opener at home.

Senior forward Bob Kummer scored 34 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead the Shamrocks, while senior center Chad Varga contributed 26 points on 11-of-15 shooting and grabbed 10 rebounds.

The Shamrocks enjoyed a 44-28 halftime lead and turned the second half into a dunking exhibition as Kummer finished with five dunks and Varga one. The loss ended Southfield's season at 15-6 overall.

"They were too much for us," Southfield coach Harry Vandenbrink said of the two 6-foot-6 CC stars. "I don't understand how some games they score only 12 or 13 points each. Those two came to play and took control. They were going to do their thing — and they did."

"BUT WE'RE NOT walking out of here losers. We've got a big year to look forward to with nine juniors on our team. We won our league (the Southeast Michigan Association) and I didn't expect us to."

Southfield's 6-foot-8 senior center Charles Turner

missed the team bus and did not play the first half as punishment before seeing some action in the second half. Having Turner might not have made a difference, however, as the Shamrocks enjoyed a 43-22 rebounding advantage and made 30-of-46 shots from the field (65 percent).

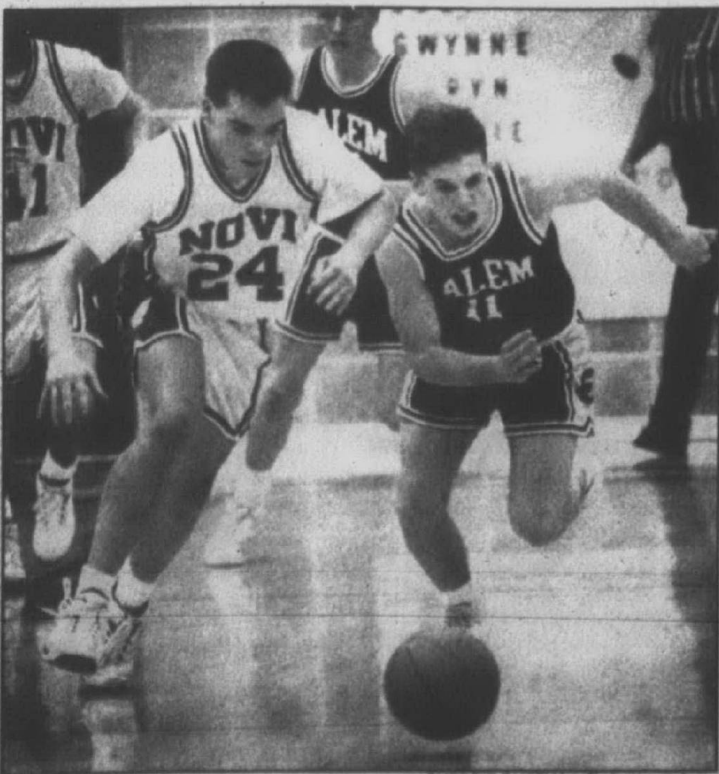
CC outscored Southfield, 18-2, to start the second half, highlighted by Kummer's three dunks and one by Varga. Southfield missed its first 10 shots of the second half and for the game was 20-72 from the field (26 percent).

"We had a good attitude, from the start everyone was all business, even in the locker room," said Kummer, who made 13-21 shots from the field including three from three-point range. "I got a lot of good passes on the break from Eric (Justice), (Brian) Paluk, Varga and (Tom) Laco. I just happened to be open and they got me the ball. We didn't want this to be our last game, because we've worked too hard to have it end this quick. (Losing in the Catholic League quarterfinal) put a little fear in us, especially the four seniors."

Kummer, headed to the University of North Carolina-Charlotte, and Varga, who will attend Richmond University, combined for 57 points in a 63-59 win last week against Detroit Northern.

Salem's Steve Salhaney, the WLAA diving champion, and Dan Bednarz also competed Wednesday in an attempt to qualify for the state finals.

## Shamrocks win Catholic League title

Redford Catholic Central relied mostly on its second string Saturday to win the Catholic League boys swimming meet held at Oakland University.

The Shamrocks, who were 4-0 in regular season Catholic League dual meets, finished with 362 points, 13 ahead of second-place Birmingham Brother Rice. The University of Detroit-Jesuit had 172 points, followed by Warren De La Salle, 169, and Harper Woods Notre Dame, 135.

CC, which qualified seven swimmers and three relays for Saturday's Class A meet in East Lansing, didn't need much help from them to win the league meet. Coach Pete Leonhardt raced his top swimmers in only one event each, instead of two, and gave a chance for others, like freshmen Chris Teeters and Paul Magoulick, to shine.

TEETERS, THE brother of CC standout Randy Teeters, won the 100-yard breaststroke in a personal best time of 1 minute, 4.22 seconds. Teeters' previous best time in the event was 1:09.00.

"Chris works real hard and was rested," CC coach Pete Leonhardt said. "It was the best thing that happened in Chris' career and he's going to be a good one."

Magoulick didn't win a race, but he finished second in the 50 freestyle in 22.91, which was far better than his previous best time of 23.7.

"To drop .08 is incredible in the 50," Leonhardt said.

Senior Kevin Markell also excelled, taking second place in the 200 freestyle in 1:49.92.

James Leslie, Randy Teeters and Chris Meck, each of whom already had qualified for the state meet, were individual winners. Leslie won the 200 Individual Medley in 2:01.50 and Meck recorded a lifetime best in the 100 butterfly at 55.14. Meck's previous best time was 56.8.

Teeters won the 100 backstroke in a personal best time of 54.95. The Shamrocks' 200 medley relay team also was victorious, in 1:41.57.

"WE WERE hoping to win using as little as possible," Leonhardt said. "Brother Rice swam great, is very well coached, very disciplined. The meet for us was not won by our frontliners. The meet was won by our second-stringers. We had our best league meet CC had in the last four years."

son scored 36.8, Coldwater's Kim Langley 36.05, Western Lakes Activities Association champ Kim Rennolds of Canton 36 and Makins 35.7.

"Kim (Rennolds) and I are good friends," Gonyea said. "It seems we rotate back and forth. I don't think it's a matter of being better but being on that particular day, and I was on that day."

GONYEA STARTED with a third-place score of 9.05 on bars, won the vault (9.4) and floor exercise (9.5) titles and finished with a winning score of 9.3 on beam. Hopson and Rennolds tied for first on bars, each with 9.2.

"Usually, I don't do well on bars, but I got my second nine of the year, and that got me really pumped up for the other events," said Gonyea, a junior who was fifth on beam and tied for sixth on floor at last year's state finals.

"I knew I had the highest all-around (going into her last event), so I was nervous going up on beam. But my friends said 'Calm down, calm down.' I did and I scored well — and I was really happy."

In addition to the three all-arounders, Salem qualified Stephanie Skeppstrom in every event but beam and Autumn Bunch on bars in Division I. Competing in Division II, the Rocks also will send Stefanie Angulo (floor), Kristen Atkinson (vault and beam) and Leanne Savola (beam) to state.

Skeppstrom and Hopson are not fully recovered from knee injuries they suffered earlier in the season, but "I don't think it will have any effect on their performances," Mar-

tin said. "When you're competing, you usually don't think about it. It's usually before or after that it hurts."

Rennolds, who was 11th on beam in Division II but high enough in all-around scoring to qualify in all events, Dawn Clifford and Jenny Tedesco will compete in all four. Kim Lewke qualified on vault, beam and floor, and Laura Anderson was a fourth qualifier on bars.

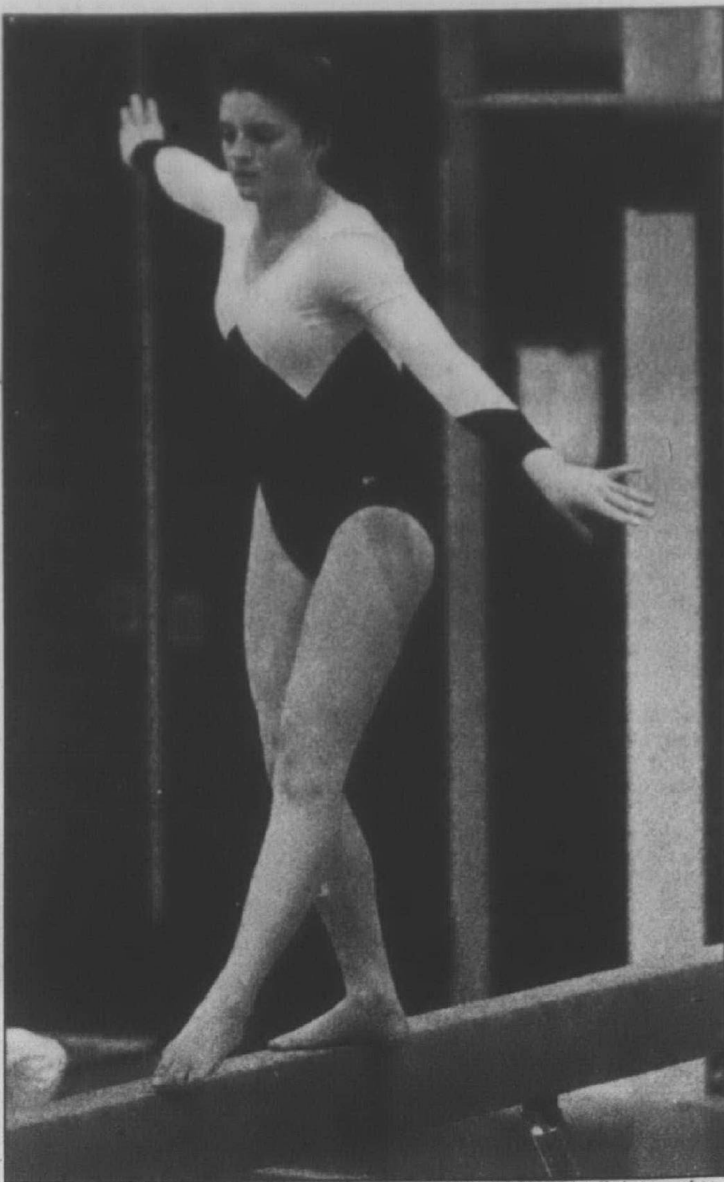
"KIM SHOULD be top five in everything," Cunningham said. Rennolds was tied for eighth on vault and ninth on floor last year. "I think she'll do better than that this year. She has the potential to beat anybody."

"Lewke has two (exceptional) events. She hit a beam routine this year that would put her in the top five, and she has an excellent vault that could put her in the top five."

Cunningham was especially pleased with the regional performance of Clifford, who has experienced a resurgence in her high school career as a senior.

She was the only Division II all-arounder to make the list of top six, finishing sixth with an all-time best of 35.6. Clifford was first on beam, second on vault and floor and tied for fifth with Anderson on bars.

"She had a fall on beam, which is her best event, and was fortunate to still win," said Cunningham, adding Clifford's scores on floor and vault are career bests. "Add five tenths and she moves up to third in the all-around, which, considering we had the Nos. 1 and 3 teams in the state there, is a fine performance. (Going to state) is a wonderful way to finish her senior year."

Madonna University's baseball team concluded its eight-day spring trip to Cocoa Expo Sports Center in Cocoa Beach, Fla., Sunday with a win and a tie. Between those games and the previous Sunday's split, the Fighting Crusaders established a new school record by winning 11-straight games.

"It was a good confidence builder," said coach Mike George, who returned with his team to Detroit Tuesday night. "We got to see some of our young pitchers, and they did a good job. We've got a lot of depth and we had a chance to see it."

Madonna actually played three games Sunday — the first one at 1 a.m. after rain delayed its scheduled Saturday night start. That contest, against Maryville College (from St. Louis), matched the Crusaders' previous three games: all low-scoring and well-pitched.

MADONNA DEFEATED Maryville 2-0 behind the four-hit performance of righthander Rob Kowalski (from Plymouth Salem HS). The sophomore went six innings and allowed two walks while striking out eight. Joe Jentzer (Farmington/Livonia Clarenceville) got the save by striking out the final batter with the tying runs on base.

The Crusaders scored on a run-producing single by Steve Coffell (Garden City/Redford Bishop Borgess) in the second and a wild pitch in the seventh. Mike Valley was the losing pitcher.

On Sunday evening, Madonna swapped Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne 11-1 in a five-inning mercy. Freshman Jeff Kugelman (Plymouth Canton) was the winning pitcher, giving up one unearned run on six hits and two walks; he fanned five. Mike Erb lasted 1½ innings for IPFW, surrendering seven runs.

Ernie Bowling's long three-run blast highlighted a four-run first for Madonna. Jeremy Krol (Garden City) doubled in a run in a three-run second.

THE FINAL game of the Crusaders' trip was late Sunday night against University of Rochester (N.Y.), and it ended in a 4-4 tie when the game was stopped after five innings by fog. Freshman Chad Wrona had a rough outing; he was tagged for four runs (only one earned) on five hits and a walk in two innings.

But his reliever, senior Chris Kloc (Redford Thurston), was more than up to par. The righthander struck out the first four batters he faced; seven of the nine he retired were on strikeouts. He gave up just two hits in his three innings of work. Chad Boule pitched all five innings for Rochester.

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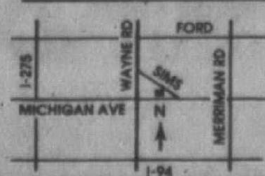
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# Rocks survive Walker's big finish

"We're even up with (Canton)," Salem coach Bob Brodie said. The Rocks lost 67-64 in the regular season and upset the Chiefs 58-57 last week in the WLAA semifinals.

"THEY'VE GOT the team with the best record. When you get to this point and the state tournament, you can throw the records out. They shocked us last year, and I suppose we shocked them in the second game this year."

The Rocks, who won the WLAA but were dumped by Canton in the district final a year ago, overcame a 21-point fourth quarter by Walker, who made six field goals (half being threes) and six of eight free throws in the last eight minutes.

"That's the kind of kid he is," Novi coach Bob Shoemaker said. "He's done that all year. He scored nine points in 25 seconds against Howell, and we scored 11 in the last 40 seconds to win the game."

Mike Slone scored 17 points to lead Salem, Mike Abraham 14, James Head 10 and Eric Stemmer

eight. Mike Kramer chipped in 15 points for Novi.

Salem was slow to get rolling but led 23-19 following a first half that was marked by poor shooting on both sides. The Rocks were 9-of-24, the Wildcats 8-of-25.

Using its height advantage to keep Novi off the offensive boards in the third quarter, Salem made a run, scoring the first nine points while the Wildcats missed their first seven shots.

"They had a difficult time matching up with our quickness and size inside," Brodie said. "Nine times out of 10, the team that controls the glass wins the game. We probably outrebounded them 3-1."

"EVEN THOUGH we had a height advantage, we had to take advantage of it. At times this season we didn't, but I thought we did in this game."

The Rocks made seven of 13 shots in the third quarter and led 38-27 at the end. Novi shot only 25 percent (3-of-12) in that period, but Walker kept the contest interesting in the finale.

After Bobby Schneider made a driving layup to give Salem a 13-point lead to begin the fourth quarter, the Wildcats went to a full-court press, forced Salem into a rash of turnovers and scored 10 unanswered points within a minute, cutting the Salem lead to 40-37 with 6:14 to play.

"We had a couple critical mistakes and rushed the ball a little," Brodie said. "It looked like our Wallied Lake Central game again."

"The three-point shot will get you out the door quickly if you're not careful. But we stuck by our guns and said 'We don't want to give them the second and third shots.' I was happy with that."

The Rocks countered Walker's hot shooting with some of their own. Using its height for high-percentage shots, Salem made a number of back-door layups and sank eight of 10 attempts in the fourth quarter.

SALEM TWICE scored six unanswered points to maintain a safe lead. Stemmer, Brian Jensen and Slone combined to make it 46-27,

and Stemmer, Schneider and Head gave the Rocks a 58-44 lead with 2:50 to play.

But the Wildcats rallied one more time, scoring seven consecutive points (Walker had six and capped the run with a triple) for a 58-51 score with 1:06 remaining. An Abraham layup stopped the Novi run with less than a minute left, but Salem helped the Wildcats stay alive by missing a pair of one-and-ones.

"In the state tournament, you have to be ready to play to the buzzer," Brodie said. "They made a run at us, and I'm proud of the kids that they withstood the pressure."

The Rocks shot just over 50 percent for the game, making 24 of 47 shots. Novi was 19-of-52.

"Salem was too much," Shoemaker said. "They kept coming off the bench. We're small and playing with the same five out there."

"We knew we had to play well, and we didn't shoot well in the first half. If we had, we might have been up at halftime, and it could have been a different second half."

## Varga scores 42 in CC rout

Redford Catholic Central needed only one of its two star players to have a super game Wednesday night. Senior center Chad Varga scored a game-high 42 points and grabbed 19 rebounds to lead the Shamrocks past Detroit Redford, 76-60, in a Class A district semifinal basketball game played at CC.

Whenever the Shamrocks win, they usually get more than 20 points and 10 rebounds each from Varga and Kummer, but on this night Kummer was held to 16 points and five rebounds. On Monday night Kummer scored 34 and Varga 26 in a 73-55 win over Southfield.

"It'll be a real good game," Miles said. "If I were to go with experience, I think CC has the edge. But Henry Ford is very disciplined, too."

Varga made 16-of-23 shots from the field in eclipsing the 40-point barrier for the third time this season.

CC led only 14-11 after one quarter but Varga scored nine and Kummer eight in the second quarter when the Shamrocks outscored the Huskies, 21-8, for a 35-19 half-time lead.

The Shamrocks for the game made 25-of-46 shots from the field (54 percent) and were even more impressive on the boards with a 40-17 rebounding edge, including 12-0 in the fourth quarter.

Redford also made 25 field goals, but the Huskies shot the ball 62 times for a 40 percent clip. The real advantage came at the free-throw line where the Shamrocks made 26-35 (74 percent), compared to 8-14 (57 percent) for the Huskies.

Varga was 10-13 at the stripe and his best moment came in the third quarter when he scored eight straight points, including a flying one-handed dunk over a Husky player for a 44-24 lead. Redford outscored CC 11-3 in the next 3½ minutes to pull within 12, 47-35, but that's as close as the Huskies got.

"When I'm open I want the ball because I figure if I get the ball I'm going to score or get fouled," Varga said. "Our guards played well tonight. They penetrated the zone and that opened it up inside."

Three Redford players scored in double figures, led by guard Jason Riggins with 16 points. Jerome Turner had 15 points, while Mallory Lewis, the tallest player on the court at 6-foot-7, added 12 points and a team-high eight rebounds.

CC's unheralded forwards, Brian Paluk and Tom Laco, helped keep Redford off the boards with nine and five rebounds, respectively.

"Brian and Tommy have really come on lately," CC coach Bernie Holowicki said. "Weak-side help has been good Monday and tonight, but we're going to need a better defensive effort Friday. 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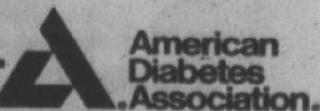

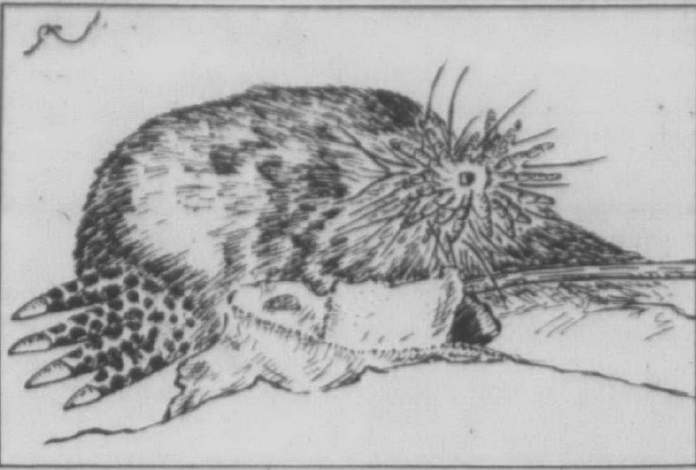

## Animals rely on 'backup' systems

In the age of computers one of the first things we learn to do is back up data on a regular basis. That is because there is always the chance that something may happen to the main system.

Animals exhibit this same approach to help them survive in the wild. Owls, for instance, have very good eye sight. Their eyes are also very big. Some species of owl have eyes as large as that of man. Large eyes allow large pupil openings which allow what faint light is still available to reach the back of the eye.

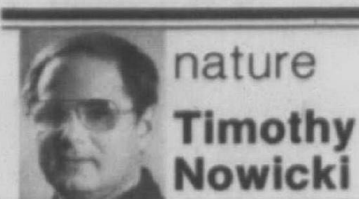
But if there is no light, no animal can see, no matter how large their eye is. When lights are turned off inside a cave it is impossible for any animal to see anything.

So owls and other nocturnal ani-

mals rely on backup "systems" to be used when light is not available. In the case of an owl, they have excellent hearing. Asymmetrical ear openings enable owls to locate their prey very accurately, because sound does not hit each ear at the same time. A slight delay between sound perception in both ears allows an owl to locate their prey in total darkness.

**OTHER ANIMALS** that live in total darkness also use a backup system. Two cave dwelling birds use an echo location system like bats. They make a sound that bounces off objects and is heard by the bird, thus enabling them to avoid objects even in total darkness.

Bats are not blind, as some old

stories proclaim, but they cannot see very well. Since most of their activities are conducted in darkness, they have developed an echo location system that enables them to function.

One small mammal known as a star-nosed mole has poor eyesight also, but has a sense that most other animals do not have. Finger-like projections from the nose of a star-nosed mole are able to detect

the minute electrical charges from the muscles of their potential prey.

Perceiving the environment is essential for any animal. Fortunately most animals have at least five ways to do so in case one or two are insufficient.

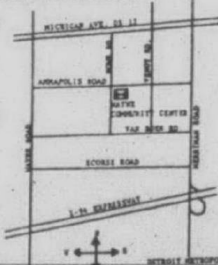

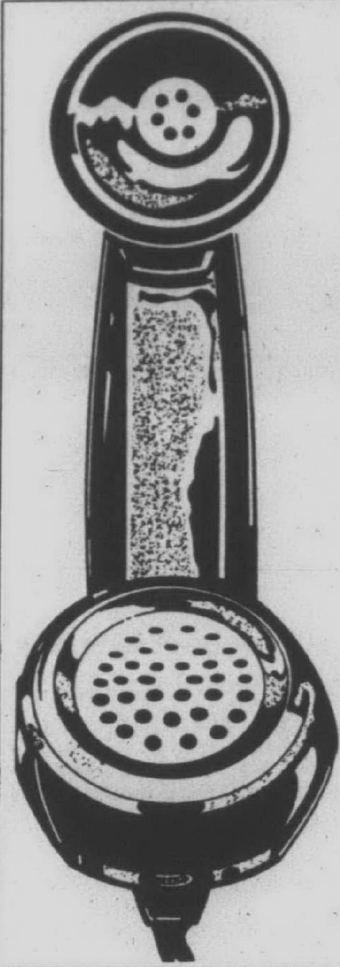

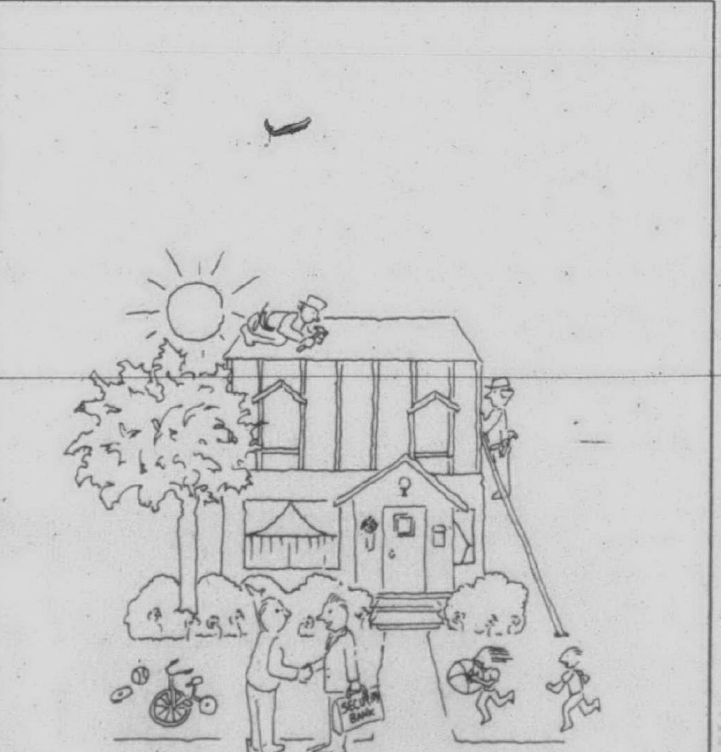

or more and singles who earn \$53,200 or more will see no change in withholding.

Still, Boesler advises to take the money — and even more if you qualify — and develop an investment plan.

"At the end of the year, you'll have more than \$1,000," she said of the typical refund. "That's \$83.33 a month in your pocket to go to a savings plan. You have interest and growth."

BUT IF YOU don't have a plan, better to let money accumulate without interest by overwithholding than fritter it away, Boesler added.

"There's a danger here as well," Hopson said, especially for folks who have been careful about matching withholding to actual tax due. "Withholding may be less than what people owe. They'll have to come up

with the money to pay their tax. It could create budgeting problems."

Who else should look into adjusting payroll withholding with a W-4 filing once the new IRS rates take effect? Individuals whose taxes are affected by a sideline business or those who anticipate large capital gains.

There has been some interest by people filing W-4 forms with employers in advance to offset revised IRS withholding tables.

"We've had approximately 200 people or so who have come in and changed their forms," said Ann Higgins, assistant community relations director at William Beaumont Hospital Troy. The medical center employs 1,500 people.

Upwards of 50 of 450 employed by the city of Southfield have changed their withholding allowance, a spokesman in the accounting department there said.

love kids," he said. "I think that the kids are our future, but before they can be our future, they have to be around."

"I wanted to contribute to that — what better way than to start at square one?"

Ozrovitz also said it helps to try to think like a kid. "I've trained myself to be a trouble shooter. When I walk into a home I know what to look for." The first thing he does, he said, is get down on all fours to see things from a child's perspective.

Ozrovitz begins a job by walking into every room and making a checklist of all the potential dangers. Some, like a poisonous plant, are corrected by simply moving an object, but others require more work, he said.

A home review lasts from two to four hours, after which he gives the homeowner an estimate and a written report.

What happens next depends on which capacity Ozrovitz is acting. As a contractor, Ozrovitz sells and installs the child safety products. The average home service is \$250 for parts and labor for what can be a four-hour to a multi-day job. Parts and labor come with a lifetime guarantee, he said.

Prices can vary, Ozrovitz said, noting that he has child-proofed homes for as little as \$150 and as much as several thousand.

Ozrovitz said he also works in a consultant capacity, in which he evaluates a home and suggests ways for the homeowners to make it safer. A homeowner can then buy his products or buy them from other sources.

"I have well over 100 products and am testing new ones all the time," he said.

For evaluating a home, Ozrovitz charges \$50; for evaluating a business, he charges \$100.

## Kids' safety spawns business

As many as 44 percent of injuries suffered by children brought into Children's Hospital in Detroit occur in the home.

That, says Child Safety Co. president Aaron Ozrovitz, is too many. His company sells and installs child safety protection devices.

"If you go into any home in the state of Michigan, that home is not being built for a 6-month old baby," he said.

Ozrovitz said he got the idea for the child safety company after some of his friends began to have children. "I'd call them up say, 'Hey, let's go golfing.' But they would say 'I can't, I have to childproof the home today.'"

That clicked something in his head, Ozrovitz said.

It seemed that a homeowner ought to be able to hire someone to do that for him, he thought, but after looking around for several months, he discovered that wasn't the case.

"You can go into a hardware store

to buy plumbing, but they also have plumbers to do the work for those who aren't mechanically inclined," he said. "I figured that you should be able to find someone to put in this stuff."

That, basically, was the impetus for the company he began in August of last year.

PATRICIA A. VRANESICH, a member of the Metropolitan Detroit Safe Kid Coalition, registered nurse and an instructor at Children's Hospital in Detroit, said that childproofing a home is a good idea.

Still, while many of the products geared to child safety are fine, parents have to be careful not to make the mistake of letting the products take the place of parental awareness, she said.

"I think it would be wrong to believe these products are 100 percent effective. Nothing can supplant parental supervision."

There are basically two reasons children get injured, she said. One, people overestimate a child's mental ability and assume they wouldn't

purposely put themselves in jeopardy.

The second reason is that people overestimate a child's physical abilities.

LISA SLAVIK of West Bloomfield said while she was pregnant she did a lot of research on raising children and keeping them safe, so she wasn't surprised at how dangerous a home can be. She sought out Ozrovitz's services.

"I just wanted to make sure all the angles were covered," she said. "It's not that I'm fanatical or that my house is particularly dangerous or I intend to leave her alone."

Slavik said she was most interested in childproofing her daughter Veronica's room, but other rooms also got the childproofing treatment. "I think a child's room has to be totally child-proofed."

She noted she was surprised at how many products there are on the market. "Some of the things, I thought, were a little far-fetched," she said.

But there are basics like electrical

outlets and potential falls, that everyone should be concerned with, she said.

"I could have installed a lot of it myself, but I wanted someone else to look over the house to make sure I didn't miss anything," she said. I thought he (Ozrovitz) was very knowledgeable."

As her child ages, she said she may install more products. "Mainly, I guess, what I was looking for was piece of mind."

OZROVITZ AGREED that all the products in the world won't prevent harm from coming to a child.

"There is nothing that can make a home 100 percent childproof. All we can do is do the best that we can," he said.

Ozrovitz said that although he doesn't have any formal training in child safety techniques or product evaluation, he gained a lot of knowledge as he and his friends began looking for ways to protect children from themselves and the world around them.

"I was surprised to see how unsafe a home really is," he said. He was also surprised at the range of products on the market.

"There are a lot of safety products on the market, but like autos, some are better than others," he said.

In anticipation of starting the company, he began researching how children are hurt by contacting hospitals and doctors offices and by comparing child safety products.

A standard child safety product like a cupboard lock, for example, comes in several different designs — some that work better than others, he said.

He also began contacting manufacturers of products. Prior to starting his company, Ozrovitz was a part-owner of Fairlane Drugs chain, which sold some child safety products.

When he and his father sold the chain last year, he began to look for another business to start. After several months, he hit upon the Child Safety Co.

"I think that to start a business like this, number one, you've got to

## Consultant to share insights into marketing plans, myths

Mary DiPaolo's mission is to take the mystery out of marketing.

And by doing so, the marketing consultant and newspaper columnist believes she'll also be dispelling a few myths about what it takes to operate a successful small business.

"Running a successful company of any size or type isn't about selling what may be easiest or cheapest to provide to customers," she said, nor is it merely a matter of opening up one of the "hot" new businesses for the '90s.

Her seminar, "Making it Big in Small Business . . . with Better Marketing," is being offered on four consecutive Wednesdays beginning March 18 at Schoolcraft College, Livonia. It is co-sponsored by Observer & Eccentric Newspapers.

In the stand-alone sessions, she hopes to convince business owners that small success can be determined by management's ability to put into practice "the marketing concept" as a way of everyday life.

"The companies that make it biggest in small business are the ones that keep making customers needs satisfaction their top priority," she said. "Instead of selling what they have arbitrarily chosen to provide, better marketing focuses on providing only what they know can sell."

DIPAULO BELIEVES that the most common marketing mistake small business owners make is the inappropriate identification of customer markets.

"When I hear a business owner tell me that 'everyone' is a current or potential customer of his business, I immediately know we've got a problem."

"If a business finds out everything it needs to about its most important customer markets and what they want, buy and why (they buy), better marketing no longer represents such a mysterious or mystical process."

But frequently business owners perceive marketing in terms of being able to afford a series of TV commercials or newspaper ads, she said. In fact, some of the best information a business can use can be obtained free or at low cost.

DiPaolo sees one of her biggest challenges as the resistance among small business owners to pursue new ways of doing business and a willingness to use the present economy as an excuse for their failing business.

"If business owners consistently maintained the pulse of their customer markets, they'd still be in business," she said. "But they rely on what was comfortable. Demands change and new programs have to be developed."

## Less income tax withholding could be blessing in disguise

Employees who find less federal income tax withheld from their paychecks per Internal Revenue Service directive shouldn't necessarily be in a big rush to change back, a financial planner and tax expert say.

Especially those workers who use tax withholding as a forced savings strategy to harvest big refunds in the spring.

"If you were doing the best planning you could, you would actually pay (withhold) no more than you owe in a year," said James Hopson, dean of the college of management at Lawrence Technological University in Southfield.

"In essence, what you're doing when you pay more to the government is make an interest-free loan to the United States."

You, not Uncle Sam, should earn the interest on your wages, said Cynthia Boesler, a financial planner in Rochester who also teaches personal money management classes.

"The bottom line is you want to be able to control your money," she said.

President George Bush in his State of the Union address called upon employers to withhold less tax in an effort to stimulate the economy.

"TAX RATES haven't gone down, just the amount employees have prepaid during the year," said Elcy

Maccani, spokeswoman for the Detroit IRS office. "Because this is not a piece of tax law — it's a procedure — it doesn't need the permission of Congress."

The new withholding rates were to take effect this month.

Federal income tax refunds nationally now average \$1,000, Maccani said. "One way to get money into the economy is to reduce tax withheld. Everyone's paycheck will be a little bigger," she said.

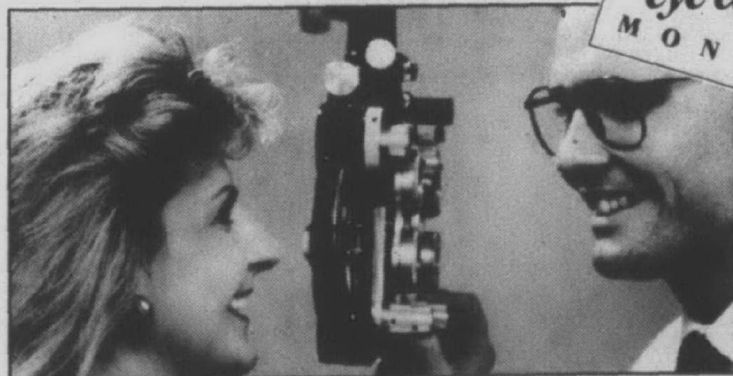

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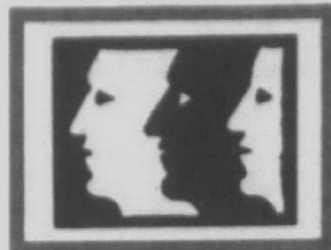

## Many happy returns Yanks catch on to Aussie boomeranging

**C**AN YOU REMEMBER WHERE YOU went on your first date? Twelve-year-old Noah Kleiman can. He took his girl "friend" boomeranging in a field behind West Hills Middle School in West Bloomfield.

Kleiman is active with Boomerang ETC (Easy Throws and Catches), the only official boomerang group in the Detroit area. He started throwing a boomerang at age six — "Half my life," boasts the seventh grader.

It was a family affair then — Noah and his parents, Shawna and Robert. Noah's first throws weren't quite the best and seem to head toward his mother. Not thrilled about tagging along, she eventually stopped going. Now, it's just the guys.

Kleiman, a systems architect at the Unisys Corp. in Plymouth, began tossing with a co-worker in 1986 while living in San Diego. He brought what became his favorite sport back with him to Michigan and demonstrated throws and catches during his lunch hour.

That was how Boomerang ETC got its start. Now there are some 30 participants, age 6-60, from throughout the metropolitan area, who gather to throw at four to eight informal events and twice a year for the Turkey Toss at Thanksgiving and Solstice Throw, celebrating the longest day of the year.

"There also is one tournament," said Norm Kern, a systems engineering manager at Unisys and co-founder of the "common interest group."

"BUT WE also sometimes throw away our friends," Kleiman jokes, referring to a farewell party given for a buddy that became an informal throwing event.

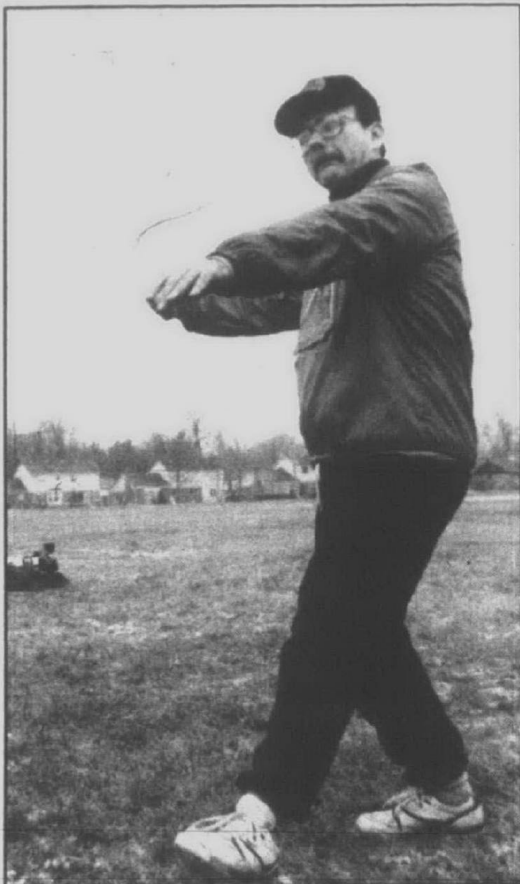
The group gathers at several locations in the Wayne and Oakland counties to practice their throws. One spot is West Hills in West Bloomfield; another is at Bryant School in Livonia.

Boomerangs are fun, according to the two men who are eager to expand participation.

"You don't even have to have seen a boomerang; you just have to be interested," said Kleiman, a West Bloomfield resident. "We're perfectly happy to loan people boomerangs and teach them how to throw."

A boomerang is a flattened, angled throwing stick possessing certain aerodynamic properties that give it its characteristic flight. It usually has two, three or four arms. Each has a cross section of an airplane wing — rounded and thick at the front, thin and angular at the back. When thrown vertically with a rotational spin, the boomerang travels a near circular path back to the thrower.

The term itself is derived from native Australian languages and is applied to a specific stick designed to return to the vicinity of the thrower. The boomerang was

traditionally an adult toy not to be confused with the other non-returning hunting types. Those clubs acted as digging and skinning tools. The return boomerang, however, was strictly for fun.

"THEY WOULD play this game where the guy who threw it would jump back. The idea was to hit the people who were standing behind him," Kern said. "We don't do that."

Boomeranging came to the United States around the

turn of the century. An American businessman named Samuel Bristo commercially produced the curved stick and included rules and a catching net.

There were only regional activities until the 1970s when Richard Harrison, "The Boomerang Man of Monroe, La.," began his mail order business and newsletter while Ben Ruhe began annual workshops at the Smithsonian Institution where he was employed.

They built enough enthusiasm to attract and train the first boomerangers to accept a challenge from Australia in 1980. That gave the sport national recognition and the United States Boomerang Association was created.

While you may not think of boomeranging as a sport, there really is more to it than the basic tossing and catching.

For advanced boomerangers, there's tuning and taping — twisting and bending the boomerang to affect its flight pattern. Using a tape on a boomerang can make it fly longer or shorter distances or slow down its spin. Holes also are drilled in the stick to kill the spin.

ONCE THE initial skills are learned, there are trick throws and catches to master to keep boomerangers from getting bored, according to Kern who designs and sells boomerangs for both right- and left-handed throwers.

Juggling is throwing two boomerangs and keeping one in the air at all times until one drops. The record is 89 juggles.

Doubling consists of throwing two boomerangs together one-handed. After the first throw, the stick must be caught two-handed. The second time it must be caught one-handed. And the third catch must occur with one in the right hand and one in the left hand.

In competition, the doubling throws and catches are repeated and the number of catches are added up for the score.

In competitive consecutive catching, all members of the group throw simultaneously. The first throw is caught in two hands, the second in the left hand, the third in the right hand, the fourth behind the back, the fifth under the leg and the sixth between the feet.

WHILE THE sport tends to be dominated by men, there are a few women throwers like Callie Laurent. The 34-year-old Ortonville resident began tossing in 1982 and has placed in national tournaments. In 1985-86, she was top female thrower in the country and 22nd in male/female competitions nationally.

"They don't rate men and women differently in the USBA," said Laurent, who no longer travels to tournaments because of her children. "It's great fun and you can get out and do it all by yourself."

## Boomerang takes plenty of practice

**T**OSSING A BOOMERANG takes more than a grassy field free of obstructions.

To practice tossing, hold the boomerang with the flat side against your index finger. With your thumb on the curved top side, choose a grip tight enough so that it can't twist in your hand, but is loose enough so that it can spin when thrown.

Envision the boomerang as the hour hand of a clock and point toward one o'clock. That is the tilt at which you throw the boomerang. Don't bend the wrist sideways and keep the boomerang in line with the forearm.

Never throw it like a FRISBEE or throw it sideways. Always make sure to watch the boomerang while in flight and be ready to move quickly if it comes back AT you rather than TO you.

PRIOR TO each throw, check to see which direction the wind is coming from by dropping some grass and watching how it falls.

"Conceptually, throwing a boomerang is like bouncing a ball off a wall," says Robert Kleiman. "The wall is the wind."

Consider the wind as being 12 o'clock. Locate a distant object between the 2 and 3 o'clock positions to use as an aiming point. Pivot the boomerang back in your hand and throw it, using an overhead style. Don't throw hard — skill is more important than power.

Stance is important, too. Your left side should face the distant object and both feet should point slightly to the right. With the left foot ahead of the right foot, begin with the weight on the right foot and finish with the weight on the left foot.

If the throw and the direction of the throw are correct, the boomerang will come back. It may, however, continue on or not complete a circle.

"If it comes back to much, put less umph in your throw so there is less spin and it's not going as fast," said Kleiman.

IF IT needs to come back more, just the opposite is true. You need to put more power in the throw, tossing it lower or more horizontally. But, Kleiman cautioned, be careful not to toss it too horizontally. That could break the boomerang and, if not, chances are it will come back at the thrower as fast as it did when released.

Now that you've learned how to throw the boomerang, the next adventure is catching it. Kleiman says catching skills are not taught until the boomerang is returning correctly.

"You catch a boomerang that has slowed down and has started to hover," he said. "If it comes back real fast, you just get out of the way."

To catch a boomerang, you need to hold out your hands, palms clasped together with fingers extended and spread apart to catch it without bruising the fingertips.

"When he and I are back behind the counter, it's just amazing. We support each other. We really believe in what we've got."  
In addition to their store, they have a homemade product line of sauces and seasonings called "Word of Mouth." That started out small and grew, with the products now carried in more than 40 stores throughout Michigan and in other states.  
After twins Jacqueline and Kelsey were born 2½ years ago, the Trabues hired a nanny so Kristin could spend more time at the store. Emma was born 6 months ago and Kristin was back to work just five days later.  
Adjusting work schedules to suit their family life is one of the pluses of working together. A while back, the Trabues stopped working Sundays to spend more time together. They share job duties Mondays and Tuesdays, alternating work and child care responsibilities, which has helped Jack become more adept at household duties.  
They each work about 60 hours per week at the store, and she works 12 to 14 hours a week at the dental office.

"I CAN'T imagine having a partner (who wasn't a spouse) and doing as much as we're doing," Jack said.

Having the same goals is the key, she added.  
The Palazzolos also had to reach a compromise. Paul works 10 a.m. to 1 a.m. during the week and until 2:30 or 3 a.m. on weekends. He found that his life was his business.  
Now, even though he takes all day Thursday and Sunday off, it's sometimes hard for their oldest son to understand why Dad is gone so much. Fay's involvement makes it easier for her to help them understand, and she occasionally brings the boys in on Saturday for a few hours.  
One major advantage of couples working together is scheduling time off. The Leiningers occasionally have another veterinarian come in to handle the practice so that they can be off at the same time.  
The couples tend to agree that there are many rewards that come from working together. However, at times, it may be easier to become upset with one another.  
"It's not all peaches and cream working together," Fay Palazzolo said. "That was something that I couldn't accept, to have my husband tell me what to do in the kitchen. It was difficult."  
Her husband also found that was the biggest disadvantage. Now, decisions are made mutually among the three owners.

THE LEININGERS occasionally assist one another in surgery. "Even the way I pull a surgery knot is dif-

ferent than the way he does it," she said. "Whenever you have different ways of thinking, I always think my way is better. He always thinks his way is better."  
Steve Leininger added "I've always felt, for domestic peace, one person should make the final decision and usually that is Mary Beth."  
The Leiningers try to keep business and home life separate, but sometimes find it advantageous to discuss cases at home.  
The Trabues agree that they disagree a lot, but that things get worked out.  
Fay Palazzolo believes "you have to have a real strong relationship. You have to tune them out sometimes. He can turn around and tell me his actual feelings. I can turn away and just walk away from what he says."  
She feels that their working relationship has brought them closer together, and believes that it helps to separate business life from personal life.  
Jack Trabue finds that's possible most of the time, but not always. There can be pressing issues that have to be resolved.  
"You are saturated here. It's a high intensity. You're living it. It's not hard to cut it off because you've done it all day."

# Conference for women focuses on health issues

Though the title suggests otherwise, the women's conference Saturday at Oakland Community College is being presented for more than just the health of it.

Pressing issues concerning the physical well-being of women are only a part of "A Call to Wholeness: A Women's Health Agenda for the '90s," an all-day conference jointly sponsored by OCC's Womencenter and Schoolcraft College Women's Resource Center and Health Center.

A myriad of topics are to be covered in 20 workshops, including such non-medical themes as "Legal Implications of Divorce," "Feminization of Poverty," and "How to Manage the Health Insurance Dilemma in the 20th Century."

"We think women's health involves all different aspects — not just physical," said Mindy Fedbaum, who is assistant director of OCC's Womencenter. "Your socioeconomic status is a big factor in your health."

Women make up a disproportionate number of the new poor; they're less likely to have health insurance. Those only speak to fiscal ills.

Coupled with alarming physical trends — such as women having a one out of nine chance of developing breast cancer and women accounting for the highest number of cases of heterosexual transmission of AIDS — these are dire times for women.

As a result, awareness and information are at a premium. The goal of the conference is to provide that from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. with informative workshops and with a speaker at 7 p.m.

THE KEYNOTE speaker is author Norma Swenson, president and co-director of the Boston Women's Health Book Collective. She also co-authored "Our Bodies, Ourselves," "The New Our Bodies, Ourselves" and "Growing Older." Swenson teaches at the Harvard University School of Public Health.

Overall, though, the conference is an earmark event for the OCC Womencenter, which is marking 20 years of service.

Last year alone, the OCC Womencenter served 7,000 women with support groups, peer counseling, educa-

tional programs as well as referral assistance on medical, legal, financial, career, personal counseling and child care matters.

The staff at the center has been working since last summer in preparation for Saturday's conference. More than 100 people have already signed up with 200 expected with walk-up registrations.

The conference will also mark one of the first times the women centers at Schoolcraft and OCC have worked jointly on a project.

Schoolcraft College Women's Resource Center and Health Center had presented seminar on issues such as rape prevention and sexual assault. They wanted to do another health seminar and heard about the OCC conference.

"I told Kay Raby (of Schoolcraft Health Center), 'It looks like they already have something going,'" said Nancy Swanborg, director of Schoolcraft College Women's Resource Center. "In many ways our populations overlap since we're only a few miles from each other. We figured why try and reinvent the wheel."

The theme of women's health was partly inspired by one of the center's "founding mothers" Sadie Davis, who died at age 46 of cervical cancer in 1986.

"Women are often caretakers; they ignore their own bodies," Fedbaum said. "We thought this was an important conference so women can focus on themselves and leave the care issues behind."

Identity is covered in workshops on self-esteem, on being gay and body image pertaining to diet and a growing problem particularly among women — eating disorders.

THE CONFERENCE delves into the spiritual being as well. "Dance of Ecstasy: Using the Creative Process to Uncover Our Hidden Self" and

"Heath Yoga" are workshops designed to tap into the subconscious realm.

Physical health issues concerning women, of course, highlight the event with workshops on sexually transmitted diseases, substance abuse, sexual abuse, menopause and prenatal genetic testing.

"It's just gaining self-knowledge and taking care of yourself," Fedbaum said. "You need that information to make good educational decisions about yourself."

"That's what the center is all about: Helping women to make educational decisions. It's about empowerment."

Added Fedbaum: "Hopefully at the end of the day these women will feel they gained some knowledge and will feel good about themselves."

The Women's Health Conference, "A Call to Wholeness: A Women's Health Agenda for the '90s," will take place 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, March 14, at OCC Orchard Ridge Campus, 27055 Orchard Lake Road, Farmington Hills. 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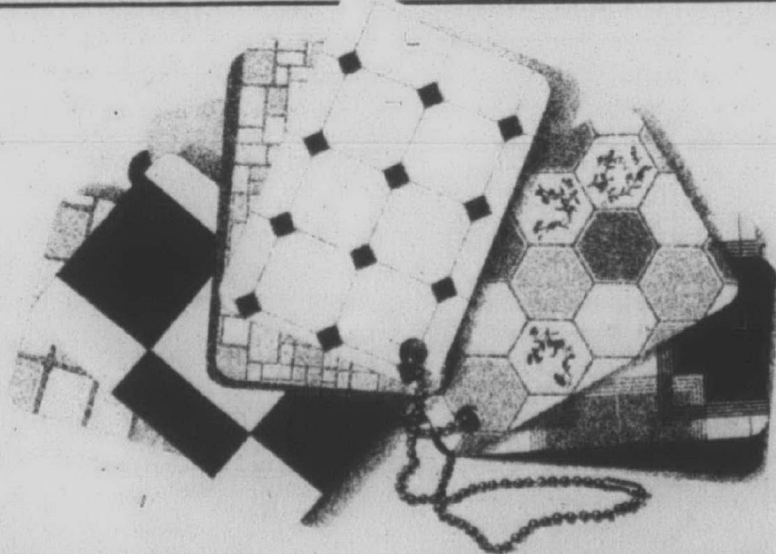

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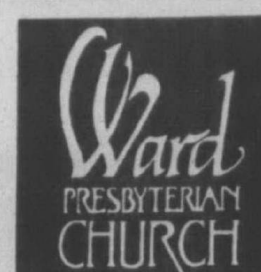

# Churches share their traditions

Not too long after he'd finished his studies at the seminary, the Rev. William Myers became the first Protestant chaplain at a Roman Catholic hospital in Wisconsin. During that time, he also served as pastor of a small Moravian congregation.

Myers, now pastor of Faith Community Moravian Church in Canton, decided to do something a little bit different at the Protestant church in Wisconsin. He borrowed a nearly 4-foot-tall crucifix from the Catholic hospital to use at a worship service.

The response he got wasn't all positive: "Pastor, what have those Catholics gone and done to you?" I said 'Just wait and see.'

Often, Protestants have chosen to downplay the suffering of Jesus and to label themselves as "Easter people." Using an empty cross in church, rather than a crucifix with an image of Christ, presents a rather limited view, according to Myers.

"BUT WE MISS an awful lot in my opinion when we forget what the cross was used for," Myers said during an Ash Wednesday service at his church.

The joint service, held the evening of March 4, included members of the Faith Community Moravian Church and Resurrection Roman Catholic Church in Canton. Pastors of the congregations, Myers and the Rev. Richard Perfetto, led the service, assisted by Joseph Daratory, a permanent deacon at Resurrection.

Musicians from the congregations performed during the service, which was attended by more than 100 worshipers. Worship leaders explained the various traditions associated with Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season.

"Determining God's will for our lives is never easy," Myers said. The Scriptures are full of stories of men and women who struggled with that.

Lent is "a time to discover God's will for our lives," Myers said. "Re-

member the one who prayed and fasted for 40 days in the wilderness."

Perfetto burned palms to make the ashes for distribution to worshipers.

"In our tradition, the palm is a sign of hope." It represents the glory and resurrection of Jesus, Perfetto said.

Each year, palms are taken down from an honored place in homes and brought to church to make ashes. The 40 days of Lent represent a time of repentance for Christians.

"THE MYSTERY of Christ is so large and so encompassing." That mystery is difficult to comprehend, Perfetto said, so Christians divide it up throughout the year, focusing on Christ's death and suffering during Lent and on his resurrection at Easter.

In Catholic churches, palms are blessed with holy water, Perfetto said. Two biblical quotes are used as the ashes are placed on the forehead in the sign of the cross: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return," from Genesis, and "Repent and believe the good news," from Mark.

In the Catholic tradition, placing the ashes on the forehead is seen "as a renewal of the commitment and the promises of our baptism," Perfetto said.

The priest thanked members of Faith Community Church for their ongoing hospitality. Resurrection Church doesn't yet have a building, and parishioners meet for two weekday Masses and other special services at the Protestant church. To show how much they appreciate that, Resurrection members gave a donation to Faith Community Church during the Ash Wednesday service.

Worshipers from both congregations enjoyed having the opportunity to get together.

"I think it's great," said Marie Morrow of Plymouth Township, a member of Resurrection Church and of that congregation's guitar group.

"It's a great opportunity for peo-

ple of different faiths to join together and share the spiritual season," said Morrow, executive director for the Plymouth Community United Way.

Resurrection member Peter Kleemann enjoyed participating in the service. He's also a member of the parish guitar group and works in sales for the Goodwill Printing Co. in Ferndale.

"We use the church here on Tuesdays and Fridays" for Mass, he said. "Everybody seems to like this very much when the two congregations get together."

Kleemann, a Canton resident, knows such ecumenical efforts are valuable during the Easter season and throughout the year. "Absolutely. All year. It's lots of fun too."

# Society lures away our self-esteem

What could the memories of a year-ago Gulf War, the pain of plant closings, breast implants and depression or apathy among students possibly have in common? Certainly, each has its own set of motives, feelings and repercussions, but at the same time there is a definite and common thread running from one to the other.

That common denominator is our level of self-esteem. Everyone needs it. Many can't seem to find it, and some do not even know that they are looking for it in all the wrong places.

Wrong, because so many of the ways we seek to capture it simply do not work. The approach that we have been and continue to be culturally taught just does not work. This becomes evident in the way much of what seems to work goes down the drain almost before we can bathe our egos in it long enough to make any real difference.

Billy Crystal told us a few short years ago that what really mattered is how we looked. As the song proclaimed, if we looked marvelous, nothing else really mattered.

CRYSTAL'S LYRICS didn't really tell us anything different than what we have been buying for years. The

framing and the matting have come in many colors and shapes, but the picture has all too often been the same: it is the surface that matters.

Medals on one's chest that show battle experience have, throughout history, been a carrot put forth for the warrior of tomorrow to emulate. Heroes have been those who can play a sport better than the next guy or sing to an audience far better than any of us can do in the shower.

But if that is all we need to feel good about ourselves, how do we account for the amount of depression among yesterday's heroes? How do we explain the depression, the aggression, the suicide and the drugs among those who have the ability to turn on an audience large enough to fill a stadium?

Certainly, being out of work has its real cost and pain and worry. But

somehow, we have added to the obvious pain the risk of losing a basic sense of worth as a human being. Perhaps that has something to do with where we pinned the medal in the first place.

When a society tells its members that life's real meaning is to be found in utilitarian accomplishment, in looks or in possession of a lucrative talent, then that society (and ours is not the only one to do it) is setting its members up for inevitable depression and even accompanying apathy.

WHETHER IT is the adolescent who thinks he or she doesn't matter because someone else can play ball better, or the auto worker whose worth shuts down with the plant, the sadness is the same. We have been set up.

Women are pushed into dangerous surgery because Cosmo and other of life's critics have told them that their worth is measured at the bust.

Yes, we have been set up and we want so badly to believe what we have been told that we convince ourselves that the message was correct. The only conclusion is that we ourselves are inadequate. So we continue to send the message to the next generation.

We set them up as surely as we have been set up ourselves. We do it with our advertisements. We do it with our comments. We do it in what we model for them, by what we ourselves chase after in the name of feeling good about ourselves.

So until we can learn to teach each other, regardless of generation, that the essential possession of a sense of self-worth is to be found in who we are and in how we reach out to each other, our collective and individual self-esteem will continue to ride on the thin ice of a solid economy, a proper breast size and the socially acceptable amount of talent.

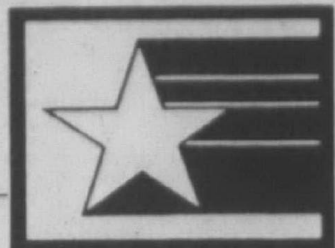

## Artful music

### Symphony concert has French flavor

Looking for an evening that's different, one with a dash of French flavor?

The Plymouth Symphony Orchestra presents "French Fantastique," a concert spotlighting impressionism in French music and the paintings they inspired by local art students, 8 p.m. Friday, March 20, at Plymouth Salem High School Auditorium, 46181 Joy Road, Canton.

Tickets are \$11, (\$10 seniors/college students and \$5, K-12 students) at Beitner Jewelry, 904 W. Ann Arbor Trail and Evola Music Center, 215 Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth and Dearborn Music Co., 42679 Ford Road, Canton. Tickets available at the box office 30 minutes before the performance.

"The music is from the late 19th and early 20th century by the impressionistic composers, Debussy and Ravel. They have a very distinctive sound, quite recognizable music," said Russell Reed, Plymouth Symphony conductor/music director.

Providing visual compliment to the French music, a slide show finale spotlights impressionistic paintings created by students of Graham Martin at Plymouth Salem High, while

listening to Ravel's "Bolero."

"There are a number of impressionistic painters who have used the pointillistic method in their paintings. Composed of a series of dots, their paintings compliment the music of Ravel's 'Bolero,' Reed said. "You think you hear the melody, but you're not sure. It's kind of abstract, but from a distance there is melody, harmony and rhythm."

Guest artist is bass/baritone, Donald C. Hartmann, assistant professor of voice at Eastern Michigan University performing Gustav Mahler's "Des Knaben Wunderhorn (The Youth's Magic Horn)" and selections from Leigh's "Man of La Mancha."

"Le Roi D'ys Overture" by Edouard Lalo, and "Pavanne, O. 50" by Gabriel Faure opens the program of music by mainly French composers.

Hartmann takes the stage singing three short songs from Mahler's "Des Knaben Wunderhorn" cycle.

"Mahler is a late 19th century European composer," Reed said. "Inspired as a child when he lived by a garrison, Mahler memorized the words to 200 songs. Later on, he used a lot of military and folk songs in his music."

An anthology of German folk poems, "Des Knaben Wunderhorn" provided texts for Mahler's songs

throughout his composing years.

"I'll be singing three bass arias from the song cycle," Hartmann said. "The music goes from very serious to sort of flippant, and back again to serious."

Hartmann, who is making his symphonic debut in Michigan in his PSO performance, spent almost 20 years of his life studying piano. From age five until graduating with a bachelor of music degree in applied piano from the University of North Carolina in 1977, Hartmann longed to study voice, but did not pursue this passion for lack of encouragement.

"I started a master's in piano, put after a friend received a Fulbright scholarship and moved to Germany, I sold everything, I owned including my piano and went to study voice at the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria with Patricia Brinton-Becirovic," Hartmann said.

"She told me the first time she heard me sing, 'you have a singer's spirit.' Shortly thereafter, I received my first European contract with the Stadtheater Regensburg in West Germany, and I've been singing ever since."

Hartmann remained in Germany until 1981, singing with opera houses in Krefeld/Monchengladbach, Gel-

sen-Kirchen, and Regensburg.

He returned to the U.S. and the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Studying under Charles Lynam, he earned a master of music degree in voice in 1982. Presently, he is completing doctoral studies at the University of Oklahoma, studying under Sean Daniel.

"Singing — it's a thrill, it's just something I love to do. I can't imagine doing anything else. I love singing with orchestral voices. I don't get nervous, just excited about doing it."

Hartmann has performed with the Virginia Opera Association, Greensboro Opera Company, as faculty soloist with Bowling Green State University Opera Theater, and as guest artist with West Texas State University.

In April, he performs with the Adrian Symphony's production of "Carmen," and in May with the Macomb Symphony. In the works are performances in Europe, and with the Bucharest Opera in Romania sometime next fall.

"Donald performed with the Eastern Orchestra last year, and did a superb job. That's why I asked him to perform with the Plymouth Symphony when the scheduled artist couldn't fulfill her commitment," Reed said.

## 'Bell, Book and Candle' bewitches audience

Performances of "Bell, Book and Candle," presented by SRO Productions, continue through March 22 at Southfield's historic center, the Burgh, Civic Center and Berg Road. Tickets at the Southfield Senior Adult Center or call 354-9362.

The Standing Room Only's presentation of "Bell, Book and Candle," John van Druen's successful 1950s comedy/fantasy, is a balanced and well-rehearsed show.

This production's opening night proved to have a tenuous launch, but as a whole is entertaining.

Due to its popularity on Broadway, "Bell, Book and Candle" was later picked up as "Bewitched" on television. Director Marje King has found the same comedy flavor and timing of the hit sit-com in her interpretation of the play. Although the beginning needs a bigger bang, the remainder of the show swings into an evening of humorous theater trickery.

"BELL, BOOK and Candle" begins with a romance between a witch, Gillian Holroyd (played by Anne Benedict), and a mere mortal, Shepperd Henderson (played by John Stempien). This first encounter between the two leads lacks the little flirtations necessary to create dramatic tension and imply interest be-

tween two people, or at least Gillian's interest, as she's the most eager to embark on the relationship.

Benedict (whose mysterious looks are perfectly suited to the part) is a good actress. Her performance does become more intriguing as the show progresses, as depth is brought into the character of Gillian. The usually light-hearted 50s style of anguishing over lost love is taken more seriously in this production, with a more emotional and realistic interpretation of the lines in the script.

Gillian casts a spell on her neighbor, Shepperd Henderson, causing him to immediately fall in love with her. Much humor is found as Shep becomes a disbelieving and reluctant student learning all about witches and witchcraft. Stempien is convincing as Shep, but his opening night acting style is technical rather than relaxed, and this too fosters a less romantic atmosphere in the beginning of the play.

Nicky Holroyd, Gillian's brother,

is drawn by Steve Ziska as an energetic, fun-loving young warlock who uses his magic more to play pranks than anything else. Ziska is a strong actor.

**THE TRICKS** used to demonstrate witchcraft (cupboards opening/closing and lights going on and off at the snap of a finger) are funny because Ziska's sure acting has created a mixture of a cocky yet charming warlock.

Margaret Gilkes is Aunt Queenie who is also a witch (albeit one of dubious potential), and Gilkes plays her with zeal. Gilkes' biggest asset is her mischievous smile which creates a quite likable character with a lot of personality.

Aunt Queenie thinks she is being helpful when innocently explaining witch customs to her niece's mortal beau like, "Sex is almost encouraged!" Gilkes' comedy style is adorable when delivering lines such as, "have her fall in love with someone

unsuitable; a politician, perhaps."

At the core of the plot is Sidney Redlitch, a writer of witchcraft and witches who fears both. Dave Gilkes was cast as Sidney at the 12th hour, and holds his own during the play. (Originally stage manager, Gilkes stepped into the role only two weeks before opening). Fond of belting down drinks, Sidney writes of the current witch hangouts, and uses Nicky for mystical information.

Rounding out the cast is Harry, who gives his first performance with SRO as Pyewacket, Gillian's cat. He is extraordinarily believable in his execution, with a keen ability to concentrate on the role at hand.

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# Kavner steps into first starring role in 'This Is My Life'

Whether she's playing Rhoda's sister or supplying the voice of Marge Simpson, Julie Kavner is best — often brilliant — in small doses. The successful character actress perhaps realized this when stepping into her first starring role.

"You see, 'This Is My Life,' running exclusively at the Maple Theatre in Bloomfield, is not simply the story of Kavner's aspiring standup comic. It also focuses on the two

daughters who wish she was home more and on the road less.

At the beginning, Dottie practices her schtick while selling cosmetics at the mall. When her aunt dies and wills her a home, she immediately sells the place and sets out for New York and a career in show business.

After auditioning in nightclubs where she "wouldn't drink out of the glasses," Dottie lands an agent (Carrie Fisher) who proves Dottie's belief that you are only two phone calls away from anyone in the world.

When she's home, Dottie fills her children with what she calls "life lessons." Meanwhile, the kids provide Dottie with some of her best material which grates on the oldest daughter who doesn't enjoy watching her teenage quirks exposed on national talk shows.

WITH DOTTIE away in Los Angeles and Vegas, you understand the children's longing. An hour into the film, you only see the mother on television or when the kids visit her on location.

Comic friends who live in the same apartment building baby-sit the girls. One recites bad poetry and puns about moose and fish. Another plays 1960s board games and offers her own simple life lesson about popularity, based on the old "Archie" comic books.

"Girls are either Betty or Veronica," she says. "Veronica always gets everything and Betty always wishes she was Veronica."

The lesson hits close to home with

the girls. The younger daughter is pretty and outgoing. The other is more self-conscious and sensitive, especially in her romantic relationships with the equally awkward boy she meets in school.

Carrie Fisher plays the quintessential California agent, dressed in expensive drapery clothes, a cigarette constantly between her fingers. Betty Dan Aykroyd, who looks more and more like John Candy with every film, actually resorts to swallowing paper napkins to get laughs. It doesn't work.

Nora Ephron, best known for writing "Heartburn," makes her directorial debut here with the pace and look of a Woody Allen film. And sometimes this film is just as funny, with insightful gags flying fast and furious. Some of them stick. Some of them don't.

Advertisements for "This Is My Life" have already revealed one of the best lines:

"If the kids have the choice of Mom in Hawaii in ecstasy or Mom in the next room depressed and contemplating suicide," she says in yet another life lesson, "they'd pick Mom in the next room."

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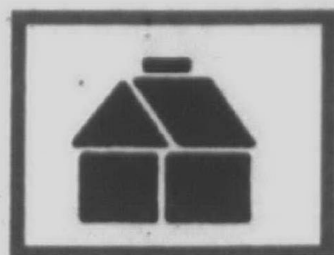

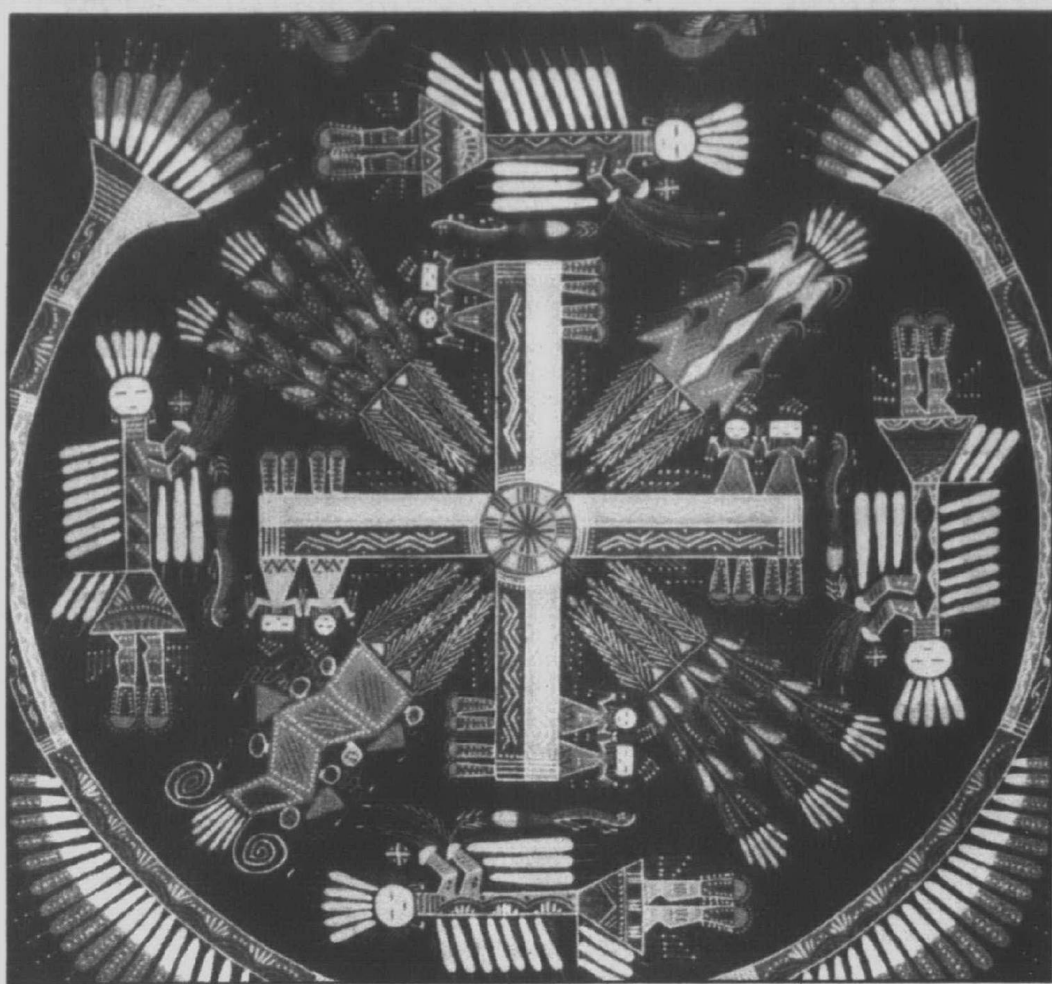

NAVAJO ARTISTS Chester Begay and Alberta Tsosie of Farmington, N.M., will demonstrate their award-winning sandpainting techniques in a return visit to the Native West Gallery in Plymouth Friday-Sunday, March 13-15.

Navajo sandpainting art captures in permanent form ceremonial paintings created by a Shaman (Medicine Man) to restore health and harmony.

"To me, the exciting part is you have the opportunity to see the sandpainting here in Plymouth," said Becky Dodson, Native West co-owner with husband, Doug.

"Until you see them working on the sandpaintings, people can't believe they do it by hand."

Accompanying Begay and Tsosie on their second visit, Native American art collector and trader Vince Ferrari, of the Arroyo Trading Co. in New Mexico, brings more than 300 sandpaintings and a selection of authentic Navajo rugs to Native West.

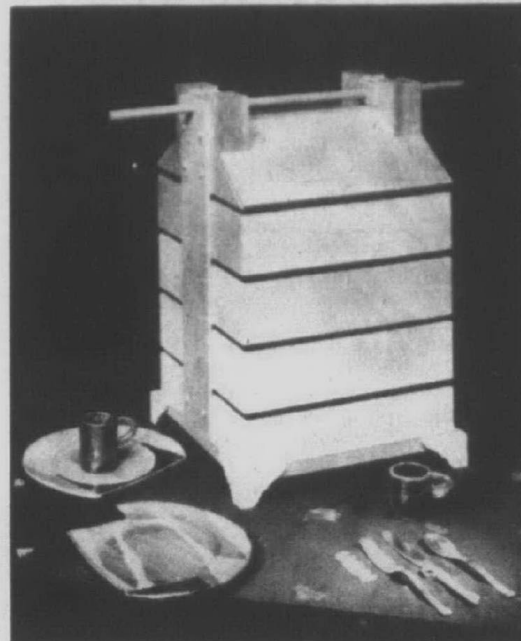
While Begay and Tsosie paint, Ferrari will interpret symbolism in the traditional sandpaintings and relay the legend and lore behind the Navajo art form.

"Navajo are the only people in the world who create sandpaintings as part of their culture. Navajo sandpaintings are used specifically for religious, ceremonial and curing purposes," said Ferrari in a telephone interview from his New Mexico trading post.

## Young designers put stylish ideas to functional use

Playful and practical, fantastic and functional, an exhibit by Center for Creative Studies students, including two from Observerland, graces the Michigan Design Center in Troy this month.

The display, in the Zeising Associates showroom at the center, features original designs for tables, chests and other items. They are furnishings that set style as well as a place. They may resemble optical illusions, but offer optimum efficiency.

Some of the pieces resemble large insects or whirligigs. One looks like a large hand mirror. One tea service set is shaped like a bird's nest and could balance across a bathtub.

"The project was initiated to give the designer a many-faceted problem, to bring together many disciplines, and to force the designer to incorporate not only the esthetics

and mechanics of design, but also to design a product with emotion and spirit of life — a celebration of love, history and the human spirit," said William House, CCS industrial design chairman.

DAVID NORGROVE of Plymouth designed a "celebration chest," an elaborate picnic basket.

Colonial America was the inspiration for the chest and patterns for the plates, silverware, cups and cloth. The maple wood chest resembles a little house — its top is reminiscent of the roof of the governor's mansion in Williamsburg, Va., Norgrove said.

Robin Schmidt of Rochester designed a table that won second place in the Northern Engraving Project, a competition sponsored by a company that challenged students to use an aluminum material differently.

## Seed money for arts and entertainment goes begging

GARDEN CITY has budgeted \$3,000 as seed money for cultural or entertainment events, but no takers have surfaced yet during the 1991-92 fiscal year.

And that's a shocker, given the sorry state of arts funding in Michigan.

Lack of publicity no doubt is a big reason the seed money for up-front event costs has gone untouched this year and has been tapped only five times since first offered in 1988.

"We're hoping to change that," said fine arts guru Norma McQueen, a Garden City Entertainment & Arts Commission member. "We're trying to make more people in the community aware of what we do."

"We're here with money and thought we'd have to beat people away," said Marie Mack, commission chairwoman. "But people either aren't aware we're here or don't see

our service as something to seek out."

GROUPS OR individuals may apply for seed money through commission liaison Elissa Breen at Maplewood Community Center: 525-8846.

Applicants don't have to live in Garden City, but targeted events must be aimed primarily at local residents. Applications are due at least three weeks before seed money is needed.

Craft shows, garden walks, musical concerts and theater events are all candidates for seed money.

"We're very flexible," Mack said. "But we must be assured that Garden City residents are the intended audience."

"Our mission is really quite simple — to boost the quality of life in Garden City through support and encouragement of creative and cultural activities," added McQueen, Garden City Fine Arts Association president and director of The Art Gallery on Ford Road.

SEED MONEY can be used for up-front costs such as tickets, hospitality, fliers, posters, performer fees, promotion, facility rental and copyright.

"We see the money acting as a springboard — to help groups get their events off the ground," Mack said.

Recipients can keep event proceeds beyond repayment of the seed money.

In existence since 1988, the Garden City Entertainment & Arts Commission saw its loan pool cut from

\$8,000 to \$3,000 in 1991 as part of city budget tightening.

Commissioners are preparing a survey to assess not only service group interest in the arts but also to educate people about the seed money program.

"By taking the pulse of the community, we hope to see what kind of entertainment they'd like to sponsor," McQueen said.

"Our job isn't to plan events, of course, but we can encourage and promote the kinds of creative and cultural activities people want."

OVER THE years, seed money has defrayed planning costs for a children's play, two family dinner theaters, a mystery theater and a spring cabaret.

Although emphasis has been on performing arts, visual arts also are encouraged. Garden City Fine Arts

Association hosted the spring cabaret, spicing it with fine art created by its membership.

Personally, I'd like to see the fine art of local artists exhibited at every event made possible by a seed grant. What better way to bring together the artistry of the visual and performing arts?

I applaud city leaders for caring enough in these tight economic times to make the seed money available. The offer seems too good to pass up.

But with seeming little interest, McQueen wonders if the city might find better use for the money.

As she put it: "I'd hate to see that. What we're doing can really make or break an event that's strapped for money. That's the message we're trying to get out."

# Native West's palette — art of sandpainting

THE NAVAJO traditionally incorporate sandpaintings, chants, herbs, prayers and songs into ceremonies to restore balance in the universe.

"Navajo believe the universe is delicately balanced — that sky, earth, water, animals and man are each connected in a certain context of earth and environment, and man is the mediator," Ferrari said.

"When man has done something to upset the balance causing an illness or disaster, balance needs to be restored. To realize it, they do the sandpaintings."

Held in the ailing or offending person's hogan, the sandpainting ceremony begins upon a bed of white sand cast on the dirt floor, Mother Earth. A Shaman, using five sacred colors of sand retrieved from Mother Earth, draws a ceremonial design, kept secret by the Navajo for hundreds of years.

When completed, he touches a significant place on the painting, then relays the "medicine" by touching the person, restoring harmony and health. The ceremony completed, the sandpainting is swept onto a blanket

and before the sun sets, cast into the wind.

WHILE MORE than 1,000 ceremonial sandpaintings exist, less than half have been recorded. Many live only in the memories of aging Navajo medicine men. When they die, these powerful secrets will be lost forever.

Until 30 years ago, sandpaintings lacked permanency. In 1960, David Villaseñor developed a "How to Sandpaint" kit intended for children and with it, the Navajo permanently recorded their first ceremonial sandpainting.

"The Navajo are very private people. They aren't about to let you or I, or anyone else, know their secrets. That's why certain details have been changed or left out of these sandpaintings," Ferrari said.

Today, the paintings, created on particle board, remain a significant link in recording the history of a dying culture. Sandpaintings not only relate ceremonial designs, but Navajo lore and legend as well.

"There are sandpaintings that tell stories like 'Coyote Stealing Fire,' the Navajo Creation story, how the

coyote have a short, little stubby tail because it was burned off by an ember," Ferrari said.

Coyote's tail was shortened forever when the frivolous coyote stealing fire from the sleeping Fire God left a trail of embers burning his tail.

BEARS DOMINATED smaller sandpaintings Ferrari brought to Native West last September.

"The bear was one of the most powerful and respected animals in Navajo culture," Ferrari said. "In fact, tribes all over the continent pay homage to the bear. The bear is a sign of power."

Sandpaintings begin on a prepared ground of sand. Using fine brushes, the designs are painted in glue. Sand is placed in the palm and allowed to trickle out onto the glue from the index finger using the thumb to regu-

late the flow. The flow must be even or a line will lack that clean, sharp look.

"After all these years, I still don't believe that steady of hand yields that flowing with color and design," Ferrari said.

Besides traditional sandpainting, Ferrari will bring contemporary sand art created by artists such as Jerald Sherman. Sherman, best known for his Kachinas, uses mixed media of sand, oil and acrylic paints.

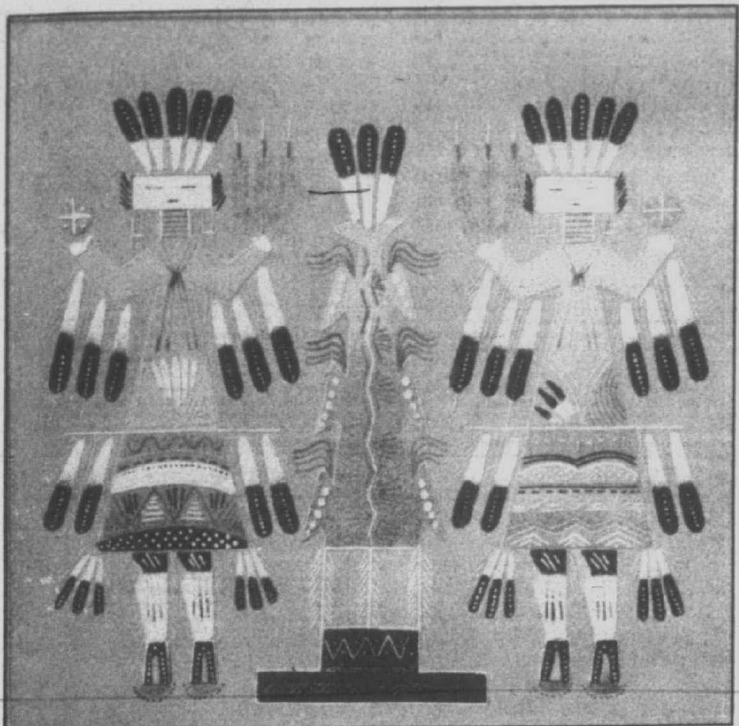
"The sandpainting market used to be strictly a collector's market or souvenir market," said Ferrari. "Today it's a decorator's market because people are decorating their home in Southwestern colors and themes."

REFLECTING THAT, the Navajo's color and size of sandpaintings have changed to meet that need.

"There is a variety of color schemes from traditional to the softer colors," Dodson said. "Alberta and Chester have designed a triptych sandpainting for over the couch and a couple of diptychs also."

Navajo sandpaintings on exhibit at Native West contain sacred colors to quiet the soul.

Hours for demonstrations by Begay and Tsosie are 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Friday-Saturday and 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday. For information, call the gallery: 455-8838. The gallery is at 863 W. Ann Arbor Trail.

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# Flashy

## Get red out of your photographs

Have you ever taken flash pictures of family or friends only to pick them up at your photo finisher and have blazing red eyes staring at you? This phenomenon is called "red-eye" and is not the fault of your camera or the lab.

Red-eye is caused by physics. If you use flash positioned near the lens of the camera, the burst of flash enters the pupils of your subject's eyes and bounces directly off the blood vessels, causing that devilish red glow.

Here are some tips to eliminate red-eye and put a more natural look in your shots.

Use bounce flash off the ceiling, walls or a reflector card attached to your flash. Automatic units will adjust for exposure with bounce flash on their own. Bounce flash will give your photos a soft, natural appearance with good modeling of features.

If you can, use off camera flash. An "L" bracket bought at your local camera store will do the trick.

OR SIMPLY use a flash connecting cord that enables you to remove the flash from the camera and hold it high at an angle. The angle will not allow the reflection of the blood vessels to enter the camera.

Turn up the room lights. The brighter lights will not affect exposure but will close down the pupils of your subject's eyes. With a narrower

path to travel through, the flash's reflection is much less likely to produce red-eye.

Use a diffuser. A handkerchief, thin white paper, even a kitchen storage container will work fine. Simply place the diffuser over the flash. Because the light will be scattered and softened, red-eye will be minimized or eliminated.

Shoot at an angle or have your subject looking away from the camera. If the flash enters the eye at an angle, you're reducing the chance of red-eye.

YOU CAN also use a point-and-shoot with a preflash feature. The camera's flash makes two or three initial bursts of flash before actual exposure. The idea is that the initial flash bursts cause the retinas to narrow, once again making red-eye less likely.

Tell your subjects you have this type of camera. By warning them about preflash, they won't blink and you'll get a more natural look.

So don't be red in the face with

embarrassment anymore. You now know how to get the red out!

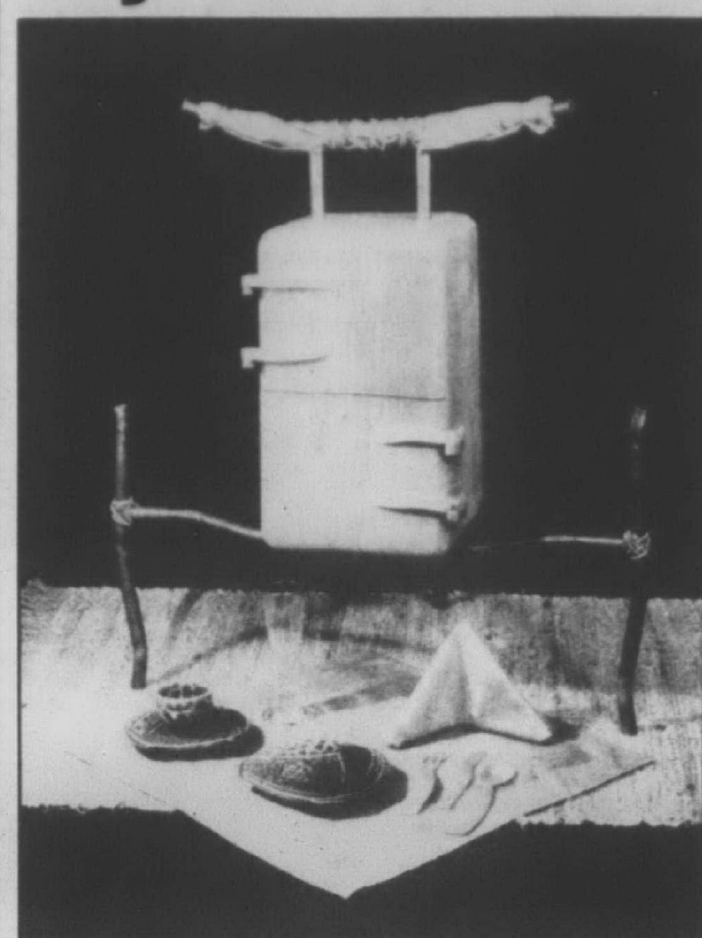

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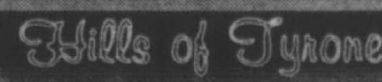
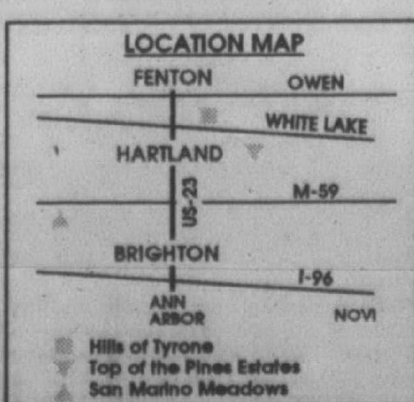

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# Cornucopia

## Women artists' work showcased

Call it women's work — art work, that is.

The sixth annual Women in Art Project — Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow exhibition continues with a cornucopia of media in a variety of colors, sizes and textures.

About 100 artists from many local communities submitted 270 entries to the show. It runs through March 21 in the Smith Theatre Gallery on the Oakland Community College Orchard Ridge campus, Orchard Lake Road and I-696, Farmington Hills.

"It's more than just a women's art show," said fiber artist Elaine Saltzman of West Bloomfield, a representative of Oakland County NOW.

Women in Art is co-sponsored by Oakland County NOW and the OCC Womencenter. Offering poetry and dance presentations as well as the exhibit, it provides a professional showcase and a networking forum for women artists.

"I THINK we came up with a really interesting show," said MaryAnn Wilkinson, associate curator of 20th century art at the Detroit Institute of Arts, who juried the art exhibit.

"It's the only major show in this area that focuses on art work by women. It encourages women who might not enter shows . . . to bring (art) in and get it looked at professionally."

"There's still a long road for women artists to go down and this points in a good direction, I think."

The exhibit has encouraged women artists to enter other shows. It has given a "kick in the career, so to speak," said Suzann Conley of Walled Lake, who with JoAnn Jones is project director.

"I think it's really important," she said. "We like to pick all media, all phases of development. Anything that a woman does is women's art."

THE WOMEN in Art Project was started as a coalition between the Womencenter and Oakland County NOW to celebrate Women's Peace Week. The response from artists has always been enthusiastic; this year's participating artists shared that feeling.

"I feel that it's a good show to be in," said Lillian Moran of Troy.

"I think it's a great effort on their (the OCC Womencenter and NOW) part to give women artists a chance

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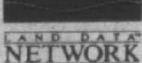
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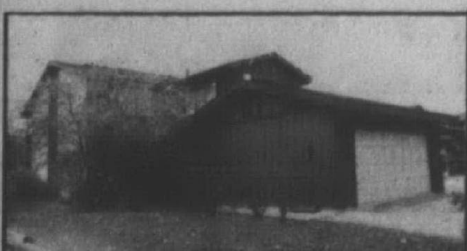
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# Cornucopia

## Women artists' work showcased

Call it women's work — art work, that is.

The sixth annual Women in Art Project — Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow exhibition continues with a cornucopia of media in a variety of colors, sizes and textures.

About 100 artists from many local communities submitted 270 entries to the show. It runs through March 21 in the Smith Theatre Gallery on the Oakland Community College Orchard Ridge campus, Orchard Lake Road and I-696, Farmington Hills.

"It's more than just a women's art show," said fiber artist Elaine Saltzman of West Bloomfield, a representative of Oakland County NOW.

Women in Art is co-sponsored by Oakland County NOW and the OCC Womencenter. Offering poetry and dance presentations as well as the exhibit, it provides a professional showcase and a networking forum for women artists.

"I THINK we came up with a really interesting show," said MaryAnn Wilkinson, associate curator of 20th century art at the Detroit Institute of Arts, who juried the art exhibit.

"It's the only major show in this area that focuses on art work by women. It encourages women who might not enter shows... to bring (art) in and get it looked at professionally."

"There's still a long road for women artists to go down and this points in a good direction, I think."

The exhibit has encouraged women artists to enter other shows. It has given a "kick in the career, so to speak," said Suzann Conley of Walled Lake, who with JoAnn Jones is project director.

"I think it's really important," she said. "We like to pick all media, all phases of development. Anything that a woman does is women's art."

# Renter's insurance: overlooked issue

Fire swept through an apartment building in Westland last month. Eight units were damaged to some degree by heat, smoke or water. Only one tenant had renter's insurance.

The owner of the apartment complex will be paid by his insurance company to rebuild the structure. The tenant with renter's insurance will be reimbursed for personal property loss. The other renters without insurance are on their own.

The lack of insurance among renters apparently is more common than might be expected.

"That's a very overlooked issue," said Tom Hogan, a financial consultant with HFA Planning in Livonia. "Offhand, I would think most younger people are not aware this is something they should have. It's just as important as auto insurance."

A newsletter recently published by the Professional Independent Insurance Agents of Michigan said three out of four tenants in this state lack renter's insurance, said Gail Coll, an agent with the Hershey Agency in Birmingham.

"MOST RENTERS believe their possessions are covered by their landlords' insurance. His insurance just covers his building," she said.

Renter's insurance works just like homeowner's and protects against fire, theft and legal claims against injuries. Rates are based on location of the apartment, extent of coverage for personal property, replacement value versus depreciated value, extent of personal liability coverage and amount of the deductible.

Renter's insurance generally is cheaper than homeowners because tenants aren't insuring the building.

A policy providing protection on contents worth \$15,000 at full replacement value, \$300,000 worth of personal liability coverage and \$1,000 worth of medical payments with a deductible of \$250 per incident generally will cost \$100-\$150 per year, Coll said.

"You get additional living expenses, coverage for temporary quarters, if your present apartment becomes uninhabitable," Coll said. "We always write for replacement cost. If there's a lawsuit, you can bet you'd both be sued together — you and the owner of the apartment."

TIM SCHWARTZ, a financial planner and Allstate Insurance agent in Livonia, has seen the sword cut both ways.

"I can't remember the girl's name now, but she was dragging her feet, dragging her feet and finally she did it. Two weeks later, someone broke in and took everything. There was another couple who should have, but didn't. There was a claim, but they didn't have coverage."

"Most people just figure nothing's going to happen or (say) 'I'll do it next week,' then they forget about it," Schwartz said. "You might not have that much, but if you have to re-buy, it amounts to a lot."

Consumer advocates recommend comparison shopping and getting several quotes.

Terri Hughes is the property manager for Somerset Park Apartments in Troy, one of the largest in Michigan with 2,226 units.

"We advise tenants to get renter's insurance because our insurance doesn't cover their belongings," she said. "We don't recommend specific companies. Our insurance is for liability on the grounds and the building, itself, not residents' contents."

Art Winkel, fire marshal in Canton, suspects that a lot of young renters don't have insurance because it isn't required as in ownership-mortgage situations.

# Court rules seller's agent owes no duty to buyer

We are upset with a broker who has a listing on a home we became interested in. But he did not properly convey a purchase offer to the seller, and we lost the deal. Of course, he still gets his commission. We want to sue. What do you think?

The Michigan Court of Appeals has recently held that there is no duty owed by the seller's agent to the buyer-customer in a similar factual setting, stating that "in negotiating a real estate sale, any relationship between the seller's agent and the potential buyer is a commercially antagonistic one, with each side working his best advantage and not for the benefit of the other."

It is important to keep the legal concept in mind before placing your complete trust as a buyer in the seller or listing broker's representations and be sure you are independently represented by a competent real estate lawyer

before the transaction is consummated.

What is the present status of the law as it relates to directors of corporations entering into transactions in which the directors have an interest, such as part ownership of the snow removal contractor?

Under recent amendment to the Michigan Business Corporation Act, a transaction in which a director or officer is determined to have a personal interest as determined by the courts may not, because of the interest, lead to an injunction or an award of damages in a derivative suit if the interested director, an officer, establishes that the transaction either was fair at the time entered into or has been the subject of disinterested shareholder or director approval.

Either fairness or approval will suffice, but the statute requires disclosure to the approving group of the material

facts of the corporate fiduciaries' interest in the transaction. If these rules are satisfied, the transaction by the director is probably OK unless it is challenged on other grounds such as corporate waste, fraud or illegality. So the real question for the director is whether he wants to even run the risk or possible aggravation.

# FTC offers mortgage shorthand

(AP) — People who begin to shop for a mortgage soon find themselves faced with an alphabetic smorgasbord of options. What do FRMs, ARMs and GPMs mean, and which type of mortgage is the best?

Help can be obtained from "The Mortgage Guide," a Federal Trade Commission (FTC) booklet that deciphers all the bureaucratic shorthand, reports Better Homes and Gardens magazine.

Fixed-rate mortgages (FRMs) are the most common type. The Mortgage Guide explains that with a fixed-rate mortgage the interest rate and monthly payments are fixed for the life of the loan, protecting homeowners against rising interest rates. FRMs are best for buyers who want stable payments.

Adjustable-rate mortgages (ARMs) often carry a lower initial interest rate than fixed-rate mortgages, which can qualify home shoppers for a more expensive home. But there's a tradeoff: Interest rates on ARMs are adjusted periodically according to terms specified by the lender. These usually peg the rate to an index such as U.S. Treasury bills. If rates rise, monthly payments go up; if rates go down, payments fall.

Graduated-payment mortgages (GPMs) make most sense for buyers who expect their incomes to increase substantially. Interest rates on GPMs can be either fixed or adjustable, but they start lower than those for conventional mortgages in the first few years, then gradually increase for a set number of years.

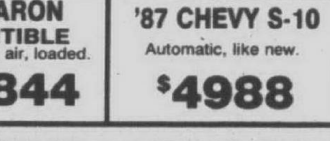

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## Priestly digs

Architects integrate 'sense of community' into apartment complex for retired clergy

Apartments for retirees present some architectural challenges.

Some owners, realizing that prospective tenants generally are on fixed incomes, would rather concentrate on interior space needs and design than exterior construction materials, elevations and ancillary amenities.

But that wasn't the approach taken by Kamp-DiComo Associates of Livonia, architect and builder for a priest retirement village under construction in that community.

The project, a joint venture of the Archdiocese of Detroit and the Felician Sisters, is scheduled for completion by September.

"We started at that point — maximal function and minimal cost of the building," said Daniel G. DiComo, project manager and architect. "The owners were potential occupants, so they had a little different outlook."

"They figured we should try to afford nice things, again squeaking the most they can out of square footage but still have a quality project. It grew on us," he said.

"It went from just apartments to apartments with carports to apartments with detached garages to apartments with attached garages."

**THE DEVELOPMENT** will consist of five single-story buildings each containing four apartments. Each unit of 820 square feet has a utility room/storage room off the garage that leads to the kitchen that leads to the living room/dining room and the bedroom.

Each unit has three private entrances.

A separate community building will sit at the entrance point to the village. That structure will have a parlor with a fireplace, a library area, living room/visiting area and game room. The dining room/activity room flows from the parlor and a chapel flows from the large congregating room.

The community building also will house an exercise room and whirlpool.

"I'd imagine most senior apartment complexes normally wouldn't have a separate community building," DiComo said. "This affords more a sense of community. Rather than being in the same building all the time, they (tenants) can move around, get out and get more involved in what they're doing."

**A SINGLE** roadway circles the village.

"The ring road is a control point so they can see everyone coming and going," DiComo said. "That provides a little more security."

The central courtyard will have hedges to define walkways and perennials will be planted to bloom at different times so that the residents will have color but not have to garden themselves.

"You can access the community building through the courtyard without ever walking across a street," DiComo said. The farthest distance from an apartment unit to the community building will be less than 100 yards.

Amenities in the apartments include smoke alarms with strobe lights and sound, plus blinds to provide a uniform look from outside. Tenants will be encouraged to decorate inside with drapes.

"The entire place is designed barrier-free to meet codes for wheelchairs," DiComo said. "One unit is preplanned for someone in a wheelchair. Normally those are the last to get rented. Those have no cabinets under the kitchen or bathroom sinks, the shower stall is a little larger and doesn't have a lip."

**OTHER UNITS** could be converted for other wheelchair tenants with some minor modifications, DiComo said. "We've been very careful to make sure everything is available for adaptation."

The showers in all bathrooms have seats, grab bars and hand-held shower heads. There are no tubs. "We gave them one big tub in the community room," DiComo said.

"There are vaulted ceilings in the living areas and kitchen. The kitchen space is not apartment-like. There's more counter space, space for a microwave," he added.

Exterior materials are brick and vinyl siding. Windows have metal exteriors and wooden interiors, DiComo said. Roof lines and garage peaks provide elevation variances to avoid box or institutional appearances.

"It looks more like a condo unit," he said.

Projected rent is \$750 monthly and includes one meal per day in the community building.

Total cost to build — \$2.5 million.

A task force including several priests and prospective tenants met periodically with Kamp-DiComo to develop the plan.

"I WANTED something light and airy, something pleasant," said Bishop Walter Schoenherr, chairman of the task force. "Something home-like, as much as possible, nothing that looks like an institution. Older people don't like institutions."

"I like the openness, higher ceilings. That's a beautiful feature," Schoenherr added.

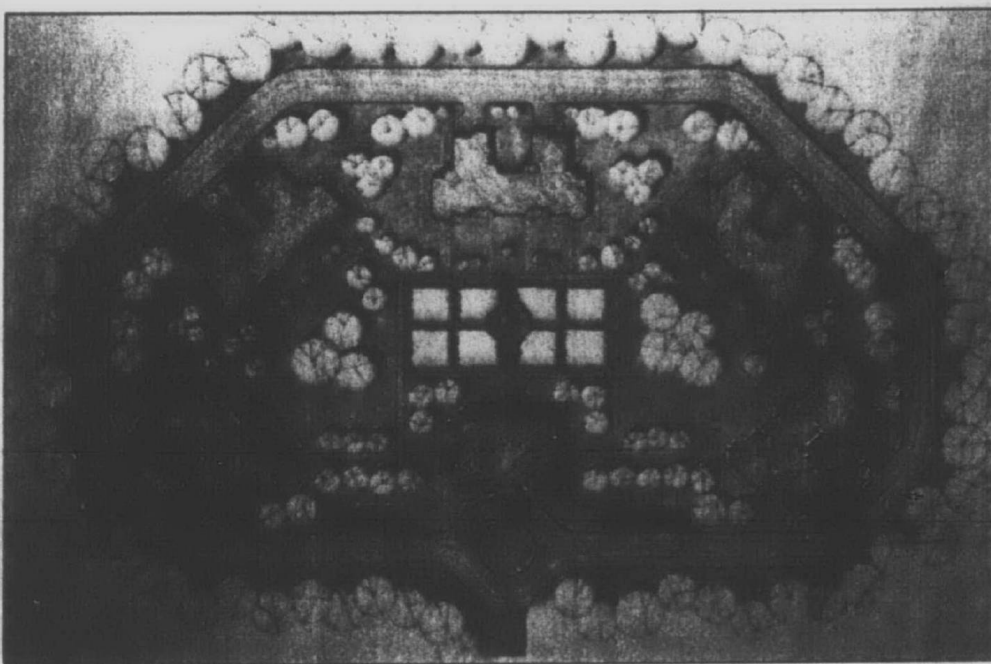
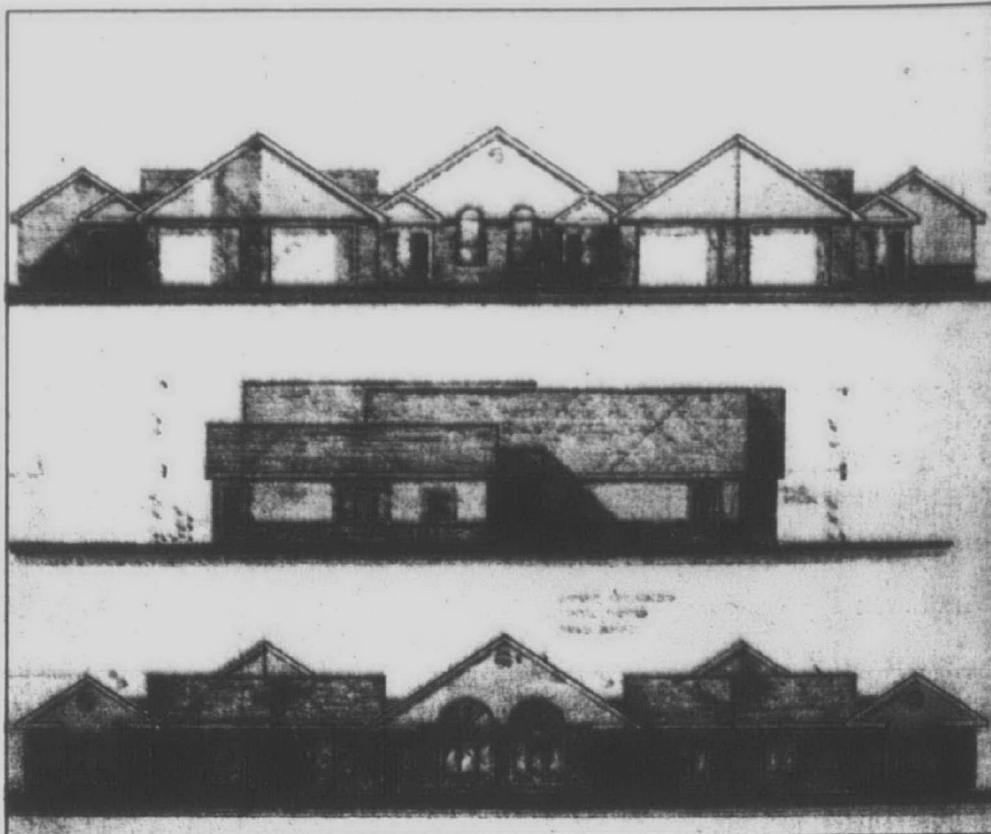
Providing an opportunity for independent living with options to socialize was the overriding objective, said Sister Danatha Suchyta, who represented the Felician Sisters on the task force.

"They would have total privacy (in apartments), but one of the components of the total village is a community building that has a nice lounge and chapel," Suchyta said.

"Initially, we felt would give cages to tenants to store things (in a central location). We gave that up. We felt we would provide attached garages, which is really unusual for most places," she added.

Garages — which might be used for hobbies — and utility rooms with a washer and dryer in each unit and a kitchen in every unit foster independence, Suchyta said.

Kamp-DiComo also has been involved with Newburgh Village apartments in Livonia, Allen Terrace apartments in Northville, Civic Center Library and Laurel Manor banquet hall, both in Livonia, and Exotic Rubber & Plastics in Farmington Hills.

will sit at the entrance point to the village and features a parlor with a fireplace, library area, living room/visiting area, game room, dining room/activity room, a chapel, an exercise room and whirlpool.

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# Local projects reap design awards for masonry

Hillside Elementary School in Farmington Hills, Merrill Park Townhomes in Birmingham and the 42nd District Court/Macomb County Sheriff's substation in Romeo have won awards from the Masonry Institute of Michigan for quality design involving stonework or brickwork.

"The purpose of the awards is to honor works of distinction, works of Michigan architects and to bring to the public eye works of distinction," said Daniel Zechmeister, executive director of the institute.

The American Institute of Architects Michigan co-sponsored the awards. A panel of architects from Boston served as jurors. Forty-seven

buildings from around the state that had been completed since May 1988 were nominated.

Hillside Elementary, designed by Greiner Inc. of Grand Rapids, was constructed on a slope in three levels. Flat areas on the 10-acre site were preserved for playgrounds and parking.

It was noted that the architectural theme is compatible with the surrounding upscale residential area.

Masonry was selected because of its residential character. Jumbo or utility bricks were used for scale and cost savings. Extensive brick patterning makes the building playful and colorful.

JUDGES WERE impressed with the lively environment created by multiple colors and finishes of masonry. The internal street brings the outside in with similar use of masonry and natural lighting, they said.

Merrill Park Townhomes, a seven-unit residential development, was designed by Victor Saroki and Associates Architects of Birmingham.

Each unit is 26 feet wide and set close to the sidewalk with landscaped courtyards front and back enclosed by iron fences.

The ground floor is a half level above street level. Attached garages are a half level down from the main level, creating stone terraces on top

which are accessible from the ground floor and which become outdoor extensions of the main living space.

The Boston jurors, familiar with the Brownstone look, reportedly loved the design. The project recognizes that traditional urban residential streetscape still has a relevance and significance, they said. Judges also praised the modern interpretation of traditional masonry architecture.

THOMAS STRAT & Associates of Troy used a contemporary interpretation of Greco-Roman design for the 42nd District Court/sheriff's sub-

station in Romeo.

Polished cement blocks 8-by-16 inches were used to simulate the textures and sense of permanent cut stone like marble and granite used by the ancients at a fraction of the cost.

Judges complimented the discreet, effective use of masonry and the presence of a judicial public facility with little apparent context to other buildings in the area.

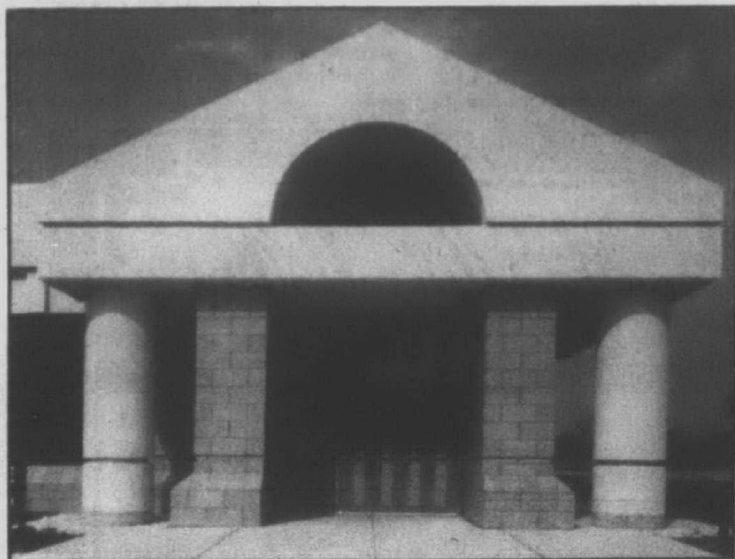
The jurors also praised the design that acknowledges the formality of the judicial function with the efficiency of support space.

Two other buildings with no connections to Observer & Eccentric

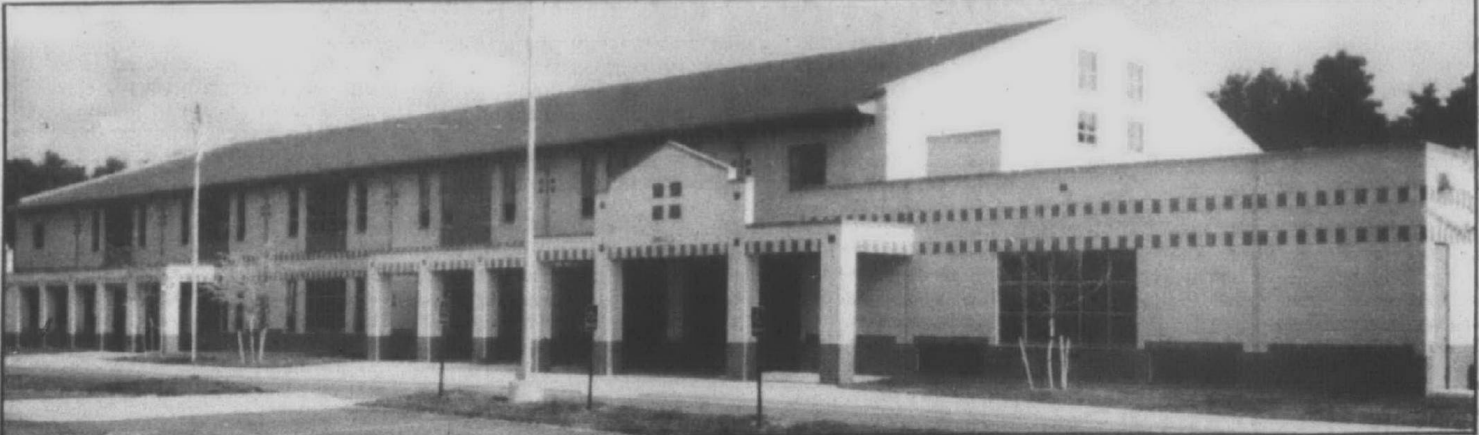
communities, the Sherzer Hall restoration at Eastern Michigan University and the Willard Beach Bathhouse in Battle Creek, also won Masonry Awards.

Eight architectural students from Lawrence Technological University including Christopher Garrison of Farmington Hills and Alan Goschka of Southfield won awards in the biennial masonry design competition sponsored by the institute and university.

Garrison placed first and Goschka fourth in the senior division. Their mission was to design a residential highrise on the site of a former cement plant on a riverfront.

Bricks of different finishes and colors create a lively environment for children at Hillside Elementary School in Farmington Hills.

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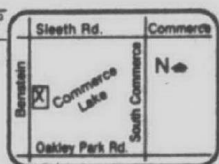
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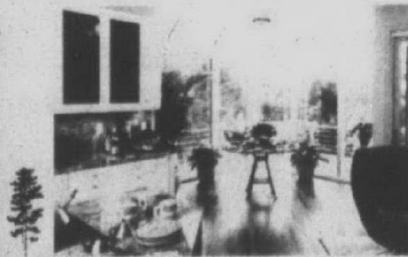
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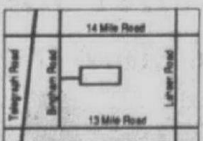
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# Economists skeptical about January sales boom

(AP) — Sales of new homes shot up 12.9 percent in January, the largest gain in 11 months and the latest sign that housing continued to lead the economy out of recession.

Except for the Northeast, where sales were unchanged, all regions posted advances, including a huge 63 percent gain in the Midwest. But analysts said that while the recovery will continue, January's rates cannot be sustained.

"There certainly will be gradual improvement in both new and existing home sales," said economist

Mark Obrinsky of the Federal National Mortgage Association. "But I don't think we'll have monthly double-digit increases."

Both President Bush and Federal Reserve chairman Alan Greenspan cited the housing report as a fresh sign the economy was emerging from recession. But Greenspan said the overall outlook remains murky because of the high levels of business and consumer debt that are curtailing spending and economic growth.

New home sales totaled 612,000 at a seasonally adjusted annual rate, up

from 542,000 a month earlier, according to the report by the departments of Commerce and Housing and Urban Development.

The January gain was the steepest since a 20.7 percent advance in February 1991. The 612,000 rate was the highest since a 625,000 rate in January 1990.

The report also showed that December's 4.6 percent drop was not as deep as the 6.6 percent decline first reported last month.

"The January numbers show that lower interest rates have begun to

make their mark in the new-home sales market," John A. Tuccillo, an economist for the National Association of Realtors, said.

According to surveys by the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corp., 30-year, fixed-rate mortgages ranged between 8.23 percent and 8.68 percent in January. They since have risen to 8.83 percent during the week ending Feb. 28.

Obrinsky said the rising rates may have persuaded some buyers to act before they rose further. But other analysts said the higher mortgage

costs could cut into future sales.

The seasonally adjusted estimate of new houses for sale was 283,000, representing a supply of 5.8 months at the current sales rate. That was the lowest since a 5.5-month supply in December 1986 and could spur more construction.

Housing starts jumped 5.5 percent in January, building permits, often a barometer of future activity, rose 6.0 percent, according to a Commerce Department report last month.

The median price of a new home was \$125,000 in January, up 2.4 percent from December and the highest since a similar price in June 1990. The median means half the homes cost more and half less.

Although the Realtors reported sales of existing homes fell 1.5 percent in January, analysts said the drop was due in part to the one- to

two-month lag between many resale closings and the actual sales.

Thus, they contend, the January existing-home data actually reflected the market in November and December, when activity stalled.

Although he did not believe the 63 percent increase in new home sales in the Midwest could be sustained, economist David Seiders of the National Association of Home Builders said the region was the strongest economically. So activity there will remain solid, he said.

The 145,000 annual rate of new homes sold in the Midwest was the highest since a 170,000 rate in October 1978, the Commerce Department said.

Sales rose 5.0 percent in the South, to a 231,000 rate. They were up 1.2 percent, to 169,000 in the West, and unchanged at 66,000 in the Northeast.

## Engineering firms reap state honors

Three area firms have been honored by the Consulting Engineering Council of Michigan at its 27th annual Engineering and Land Surveying Excellence Awards banquet.

Hubbel, Roth & Clark of Bloomfield Hills received the top engineering award, the Eminent Conceptor, for designing the city of Wixom's wastewater treatment plant. The project was completed seven months ahead of schedule and within the \$16-million budget.

The company made the first-time

municipal use of parallel plate technology to meet the state's phosphorus limitation. The plant has the ability to separately dewater and store biological and chemical sludge.

The Wixom plant discharges into the headwaters of Kent Lake in Milford, one of the state's most-intensely used recreational lakes.

Soil & Materials Engineers of Plymouth and NTH Consultants of Farmington Hills won Honorable Conceptor engineering awards.

Soil & Materials Engineers was

called upon to investigate a 60-acre site for the construction of a combined sewer overflow facility for the Weiss Street Drain project in Saginaw County.

The company's challenge was to prepare the site where soil composition created conditions with high moisture content and soft consistency for a sewer line that would connect the treatment plant with the sewage collection system. Its solution was to install vertical wick drains as an alternative to sand

drains to face ground settlement. The wick drains shortened the settlement period from a predicted 90 to 30 days and met budget guidelines.

NTH Consultants won its award for design and construction monitoring of a 21-acre cell at an existing industrial solid waste landfill in Allen Park. The design uses the waste, once deposited in the disposal unit, to buttress and further stabilize the sideslopes. The project was constructed in the required time and within budget.

According to Steve Wagner, engineering council director, entries were judged on originality, unique application of engineering and surveying techniques, adherence to client needs, social and economic benefits and technical value to the professions.

Entries will be part of a traveling exhibit displayed in schools and public buildings across the state.

## Birdhouse builders boost environment

**S**TUDENT WOODWORKERS learn how to save the earth one robin at a time with skills developed to win the Best Birdhouse Builders Contest held annually at the International Builders, Home Flower and Furniture Show.

Almost 600 seventh and eighth graders in suburban Detroit are expected to enter the contest, co-sponsored by the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers, Michigan Department of Natural Resources and Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan.

Contestants build a birdhouse designed for a specific species of bird: house wren, bluebird, wood duck, barred owl, great crested flycatcher, American kestrel, American robin and tree swallow.

Birdhouses are judged on strict criteria because each species of bird is very choosy in selecting its home. For example, a wood duck doesn't gather its own nesting materials so its birdhouse must have ventilation and drainage holes in the bottom.

MANY SHOP teachers have carved reputations for promoting the environmental value of building birdhouses.

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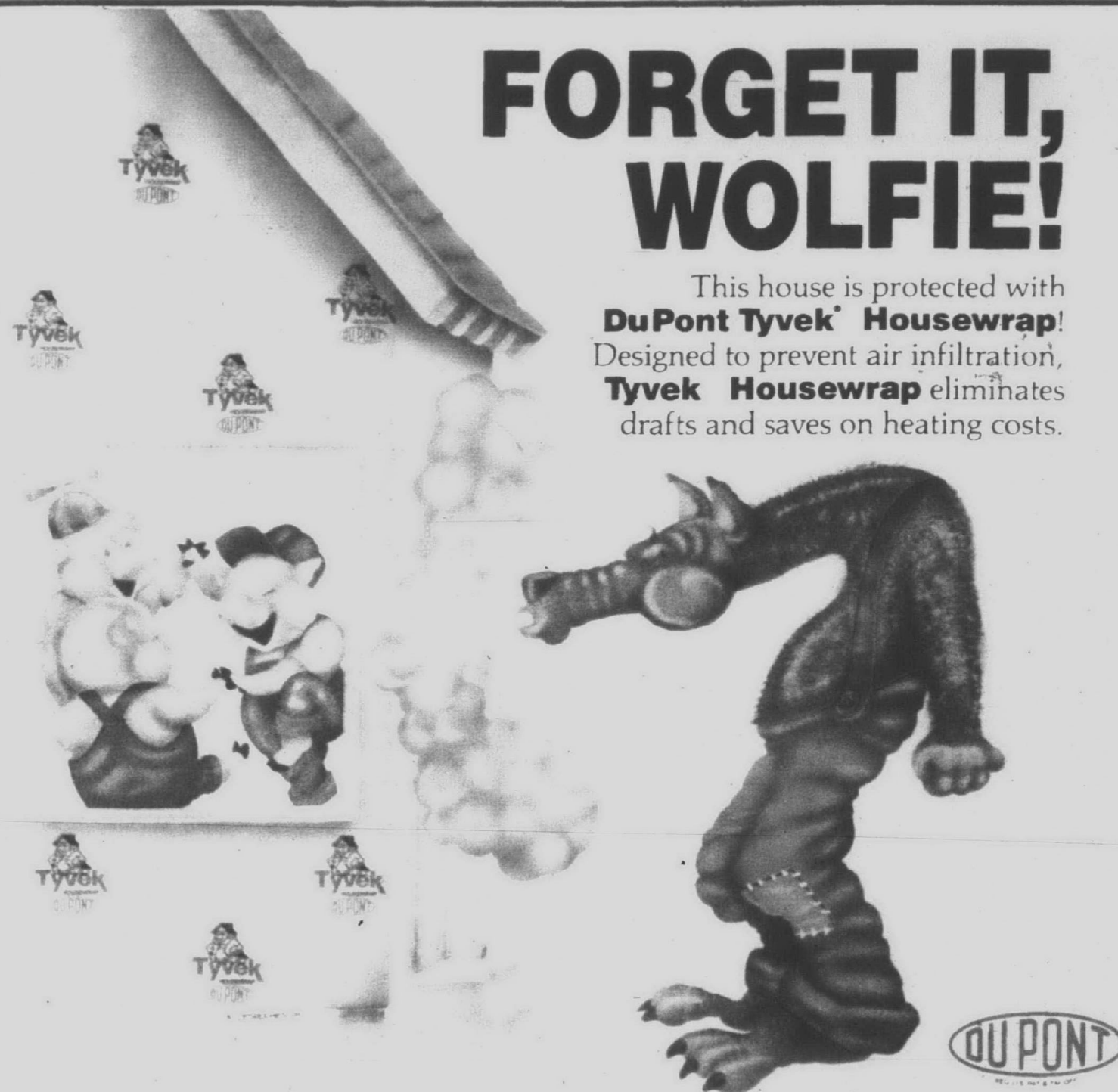

# Guess

## Nail down cash prize

**T**HIRTY YEARS ago, the winner who guessed the number of nails in the International Builders Home, Flower and Furniture Show's popular House of Nails contest won a \$20,000 home.

Today, the award amount remains the same. But the \$20,000 is only enough for a reasonable down payment on a home.

It's a sign of the times.

But the builders show contest continues to be a draw.

Trenton resident Wayne Sioff, a graduate student at Lawrence Technological University, Southfield, along with undergraduate juniors Mike Rudzinski and Marcell Todd, who live in Detroit, spent almost 250 hours (one month) building the house that was stuffed with nails in a public ceremony Feb. 10 in the lobby of the NBD Bank building in downtown Detroit. The house stays there until showtime. Then it will be moved to the Cobo Center.

THE PLEXIGLASS house measures 36 inches by 39 inches, stands 15 inches and is made of three-quarter-inch-thick

acrylic on a stained oak base. Lawrence Tech architecture majors created the simulated \$70,000 ranch home, considered an average price for starter homes in southeastern Michigan.

Rosalie Lamb, vice president of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, invited Sioff, president of the American Institute of Architecture Students' Lawrence Tech chapter, to coordinate the project, which involved 360 AIAS members. Sioff, along with Rudzinski and Todd, did the actual work.

The Lawrence Tech AIAS student

chapter is the largest of 365 chapters in North America, Sioff said.

Sponsors wanted a new, sophisticated structure.

SIX JUDGES stuffed the house with different sizes and types of nails, purchased at two different hardware stores, Lamb said.

Each judge scooped a handful of nails 300-500 pounds, according to Sioff. The same judges will meticulously count these nails on judging day, Wednesday, March 25, three days after the builders show closes.

Even Sioff, who built the House of Nails, admits its "almost impossible" to predict the number of nails in the house. "I think it would even be hard for someone who purchased the nails."

WHEN COUNTING, the judges will need to decide what exactly is a nail. Nail boxes often have imperfect nails without heads, for example. Only the judges can decide what margin of error they will accept, Sioff said.

Sioff wouldn't mind taking a guess.

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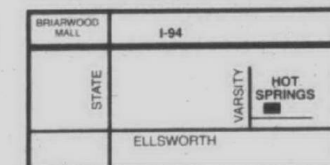
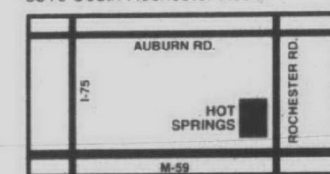

Lacking someone to share an adventure with? Some booths tout video dating services and Bibles to console the sole.

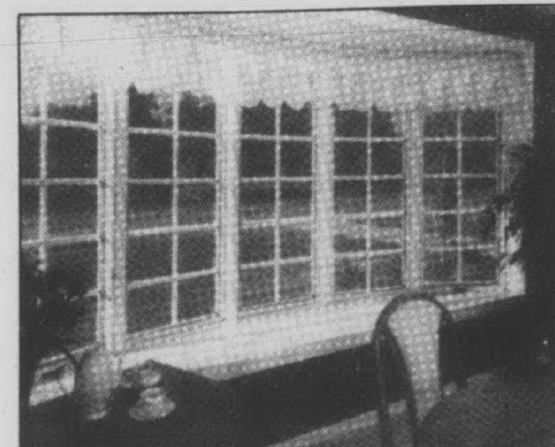

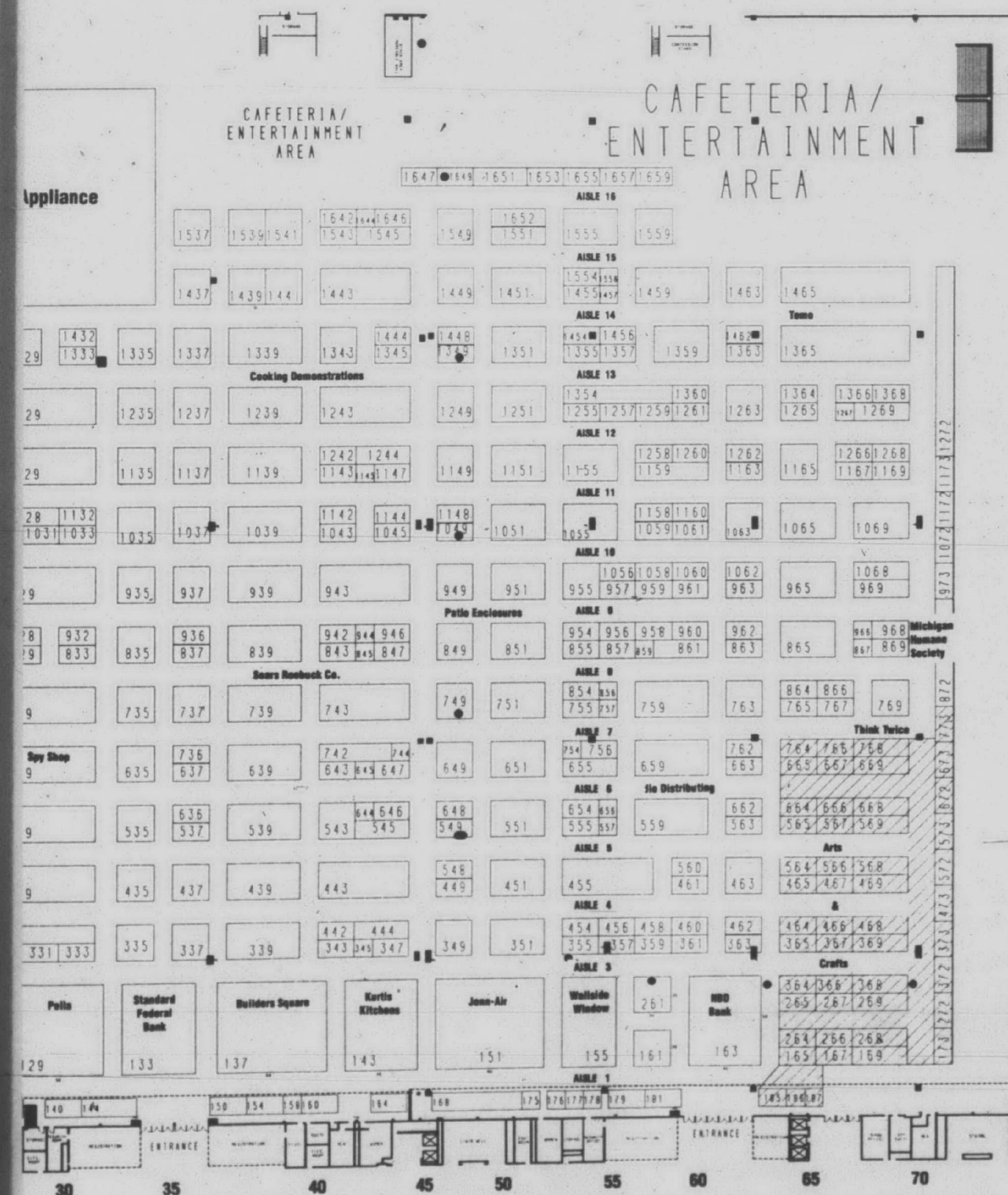

# Garden bounty: beauty, edibles

**V**ICTORY GARDENS are sprouting. Even today's more price-conscious yuppies are starting gardens for both decoration and nourishment.

Lettuce, endive, edible pansies, purple-ruffled basil and asparagus beans are some of the possibilities. So are patio tomatoes grown in a pot.

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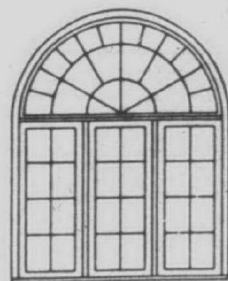

promote her 1991 book, "The Popcorn Report: Faith Popcorn on the Future of Your Company, Your World, Your Life."

Popcorn won't focus on specific trends for Detroit companies. "We really haven't worked with Detroit companies," Moment said.

Popcorn has dubbed 1992 the "Year of the Home."

"She has labeled the 1990s the 'decency decade,'" said Joyce Cusmano of the Women's Economic Club.

SINCE 1974, when Popcorn founded her 40-employee BrainReserve marketing consulting firm, she has strived to predict consumer and lifestyle trends.

The firm brainstorms for its clients who want to develop new products or reposition products already in place.

Services range from brainstorming to generating 75-200 trendy ideas (\$20,000-\$50,000) to a retainer relationship where BrainReserve helps bring new products or concepts into the test market and helps promote national expansion, serving as an extension of internal staff (\$20,000-\$35,000 per month).

The Women's Economic Club, as a matter of policy, doesn't disclose speaker fees. But Popcorn commands speaking fees in the \$15,000-\$20,000 range, Butterfield said.

Popcorn claims a 95-percent accuracy rate in predicting future trends. But as a People magazine article stated last December, it's difficult to verify that figure.

Moment won't disclose which specific products BrainReserve is responsible for bringing about. "Even though the company may approve it (release of the name of the product or service), there's always somebody who will come out and say, 'I had the idea,'" Moment said.

POPCORN CITES 10 critical trends for Americans:

- "Cocooning" — staying home more frequently.
  - Fantasy adventures — buying products or services that give a vicarious thrill, taking a trip to an ethnic market.
  - Small indulgences — splurging on a few very fine things.
  - Egonomics — items that fit body with technology; wearing our philosophy on our apparel.
  - Cashing out — leaving the corporate rat race.
  - Down-aging — no one wants to get old so we remember anything that reminds us of when we were growing up.

## Future home — a smart pursuit

**Y**OU'RE WATCHING your favorite TV program when you hear the baby crying upstairs in the nursery. With a simple flick of the switch, the baby appears on the TV screen.

This is one of many features of SMART HOUSE, a futuristic, computerized home that will be displayed in model form at the International Builders Home, Flower and Furniture Show.

The 3,700-square-foot SMART HOUSE is under construction by Wake-Pratt Construction in Troy and Detroit Edison at Knolls of Oakland Farms subdivision, on Gunn Road, less than one mile west of Rochester Road, in Oakland Township. The site, north of Rochester, is seven miles north of M-59.

SMART HOUSE also has an additional 1,300 square feet of finished space in the lower level.

"It's the only SMART HOUSE in Michigan," said William Steele, a Detroit Edison residential housing specialist.

"Detroit Edison is promoting this revolutionary concept because our residential customers have indicated

they are concerned about energy use and are interested in learning how to manage it more effectively. This technology enables homeowners to program their appliances to operate in the most cost-efficient manner."

FEATURES IN SMART HOUSE are controlled by an ordinary touch-tone phone, a remote control, a keypad or a personal computer.

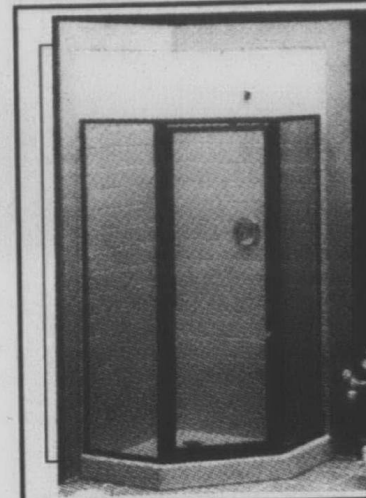
SMART HOUSE Limited Partnership, based in Upper Marlboro, Md., introduced the technology nationwide in 1991. This year, Detroit Edison, will co-sponsor development of an all-electric demonstration SMART HOUSE.

The scaled-down version of SMART HOUSE will be on display at the builders show.

The exhibit includes a 30- by 40-inch theater, which will demonstrate how the new integrated wiring works. Every 20 minutes, there's a live demonstration in Detroit Edison's 1,200-square-foot booth.

Controls in SMART HOUSE can operate from switch or a central touchpad. The activation code can be a bank account number or a special set of

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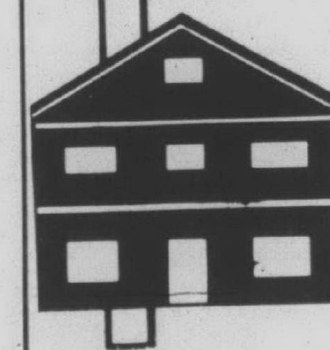
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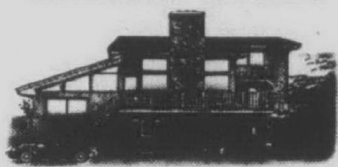
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# Show more than home ideas

While pet adoption won't take place on the spot, MHS spokesman Ron Blauet says many animals find caring homes each year via the "Pet is Waiting" picture boards displayed at the builders show booth.

VISITORS CAN jot down the particulars about their favorites and contact the MHS shelter housing those animals to apply for adoption.

Representative live animals from the nearby Detroit shelter will make short appearances at the show to acquaint people with the notion that MHS shelters are terrific places to shop for a pet.

"It's surprising how many people head straight for a pet shop or a breeder, and never think of the humane society as a place to acquire a pet," Blauet said,

noting that MHS shelters have a selection of wonderful pets in need of loving homes.

Michigan Humane Society receives 50,000 animals in need each year. In spite of the MHS Emergency Animal Food Program, which helps low-income families keep their pets during tough economic times, the recession is forcing many families to surrender much-loved animals they can no longer care for, boosting the need for good homes even more.

"WE'RE LOOKING for commitment," Blauet said, explaining that adoption of a pet involves more than a spur-of-the-moment urge. "We need people who will provide loving homes for the balance of the animal's life."

Prospective pet owners must be willing to have the animals neutered to help control the serious pet-overpopulation problem.

The MHS builders show exhibit finds homes for animals in need, raises money for the organization through donations and sales of T-shirts, sweatshirts, mugs, raffle tickets and other items; and, perhaps most importantly, provides the chance to educate the public about the importance of good pet care. Stop by the MHS booth, or call 872-3400 for more information.

DETROIT AUDUBON Society will offer free literature about its mission and

its various programs and activities, as well as sell T-shirts, video and audio cassettes, books and other items at its on-site giftshop.

The society is active in wildlife research, education and increasing public awareness of the need for conservation of wildlife and its habitat. It supports sanctuaries and camps.

Fire safety for youngsters and for the elderly will be the focus of a joint effort sponsored by the fire departments of Northville, Northville Township, Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

Their 10,000-pound Community Fire Safety House, a down-sized replica of a blazing two-bedroom, one-story home, complete with smoke, realistic looking red strobe lights and a fire-detection system, will allow up-close demonstrations of how to escape from a burning house. Youngsters will learn how to report a fire and just what 911 operators will need to know.

THE SOUTHEAST Michigan affiliate of the National SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome) Alliance will promote its national campaign to fight SIDS through Red Nose Day April 3.

Objective of Red Nose Day USA is to put SIDS on the map, along with other local and national causes by creating awareness and raising money.

numbers held secret from all others.

Homeowners can crank up the thermostat earlier or later just by calling the house computer. Central systems hooked by new, integrated wiring affords the option to turn off the coffee pot or tape a televised movie by remote control.

HOUSE LIGHTING is designed to flash on and off to signal a security problem.

Completion of SMART HOUSE is timed to coincide with the Homearama spring opening in May. By July, someone can move in.

"It (the house) will be listed for \$550,000," Steele said. "The SMART-REDI technology costs \$9,500," Steele said.

But Steele expects the price to eventually come down. Right now, he

estimates that it costs \$11,500-\$12,000 make a 2,500-square-foot house fully SMART.

SMART-REDI TECHNOLOGY, as Edison refers to it, has many features. These include multi-way dimming, whole-house video distribution, video monitoring, telephone features, built-in intercoms, touch-tone phone interface with computer, and remote, direct mode and automatic controls of features.

SMART HOUSE owners will be able to program heating/cooling, entertainment, security, safety, lighting, gas and electric appliances to turn on or off at programmed times, operate together via pre-set house modes such as vacation, daytime or romantic settings, and respond to activated sensors throughout the house.

SALLY DeROO, a teacher at Plymouth-Canton High School, helps her students hang birdhouses on trees bordering the M-14 highway to provide an aerial refuge from cars.

Brandon Boghardt, DeRoo's student, won as an eighth grader when the contest started in 1990. "We've been building birdhouses ever since," DeRoo said.

She enlisted the aid of Carl Weiman, a vocational education teacher at Plymouth-Canton High. He opened up his labs for two nights so students could work on their birdhouses.

OTHER TEACHERS involve children with learning disabilities in a hands-on example of math, science and motor skills, said Rose Szwed, who coordinates the project for the Observer & Eccentric.

More than 900 birdhouse entries will be displayed in the Birdhouse Garden at the builders show. The garden is near the cafeteria/entertainment area.

A panel of judges from the sponsoring groups will select and announce winners from each grade level before the show.

First-place winners receive mountain bikes, second-place winners, Sony Walkman CD Players, and third-place
