Town board meetings to be taped

The first TV taping of a Plymouth Township board of trustees meeting should happen Tuesday, says a trustee candidate - even though a current trustee wants broadcasts shown live,

not on tape. At the last board meeting on April 14, trus tee Abe Munfakh and trustee candidate K.C. Mueller agreed to talk about how board meetings could be televised. That was after Mueller and others said they wanted meetings shown on local cable TV.

Munfakh met with Mueller, township clerk Esther Hulsing, some Plymouth Concerned Citizens members and representatives of the cable TV company, Omnicom, on April 20, he wrote in a memo to other trustees.

CABLE COMPANY representatives said a tape-delayed broadcast aired the week of the taping would be the way to go, as a live broadcast would involve paying employees to do a remote broadcast.

Still, Munfakh said, "It is my opinion that it is preferable to broadcast our meetings live to the community."

"This will encourage an open dialogue with members of the community. After all, if the meetings are to be broadcast a day or two later, there will be little input from citizens concerning items being discussed," he said.

Munfakh suggested that the board appoint a committee to figure out how to have meetings shown live, "which would present the citizens with a better idea of the items being discussed, and provide cable television subscribers the ability to come to township hall to discuss is'It is my opinion that it is preferable to broadcast our meetings live to the community.'

sues with the board before a decision is made, and not a day or so after.'

"It boils down to a stall tactic," Mueller responded. "I think he's trying to ask for something he knows Omnicom can't do."

To show taped meetings, an interested person is trained by Omnicom, picks up the video equipment from the cable company's Canton office, tapes the meeting, then returns the tape

House votes to delay skills rules

Plymouth-Canton sophomores who didn't achieve minimal scores on a state standardized test can breathe a sigh of relief.

State lawmakers are in the process of delaying for a year a requirement that 10th-graders achieve basic proficiency levels on the Michigan Educational Assessment Program to receive "state-endorsed" diplomas.

Students are being given a chance to retake the test. The 1991 school aid act required sophomores to show minimum proficiency in basic skills on the MEAP in or-

der to graduate with the endorsed diplomas. Also, state aid was contingent upon students reaching minimal achievement levels. Almost 55 percent of Plymouth-Canton sophomores met the requirement in both reading and math, according to William L. Brown, educational research consult-

ant for test administration for the state education de-IN MICHIGAN, 58,000 students are in need of retest-

ing, according to the Michigan Association of Secondary

"We are in the process of postponing the law for one year, in large part due to the fact that there was rela-

tively little time between the initiation of the law and the time to implement it," said state Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton. Kosteva sits on both the House K-12 education committee and the colleges and universities com-

The law was to go into effect beginning with the class of 1994. Districts may, if they wish, launch the program in 1994, but must do so with the class of 1995 under the House amendment, yet to be passed by the Senate.

"Educators across the state felt they didn't necesarily have the proper amount of time to prepare students properly for the test." Students will not need a state-endorsed diploma to be

accepted into state colleges and universities, said Kosteva, adding that under the amendment, the endorsement will appear on transcripts, not on diplomas. Not receiving the endorsement "won't necessarily bar

students from holding jobs or from acceptance to college; it's just another piece of information that will be available about that student for the prospective employer or prospective school evaluating that student," said

"We're talking about a 10th-grade level. We all want our students to meet that level of performance by the time they graduate from school."

Funeral director receives heart of 17-year-old

For two years, Jerry Pawlus' heart was weakening, the result of a fatal disease called cardiomyopathy.

Now, the 59-year-old Canton resident's heart is breaking; breaking because he's overcome in the aftermath of his heart transplant three

"How do you thank someone for their son's heart?" he said, his eyes filling with tears as he sat in his private room at Ann Arbor's University Hospital last week.

Pawlus' heart, under attack by a virus, was enlarged to twice the normal size and able to pump with only 10 percent efficiency. Pawlus was so weak and short of breath he had to severely limit his activity, a difficult thing to do given his job as owner of two funeral homes in Canton and Belleville.

Doctors estimated he had just months to live. They theorize that he caught the virus from a body.

AFTER A TWO-YEAR wait, Pawlus received the heart of a 17year-old swimmer from Oakland County who died April 7. Pawlus was at work when the call came from the

'He was at our Canton location when he received the call," said his daughter, Shelley Pawlus. "He said he just dropped the phone and panicked, upset. I wasn't around to console him; no one was really around. He had to go to the hospital, right then and there.

Pawlus remembers entering the hospital and hearing the helicopter landing. "I knew the heart was being flown in; I could hear police talking," said Pawlus, who was operated on by a team of 15 doctors and nurses for 12 hours.

"It was a roller coaster for a while," said Shelley Pawlus. "My dad's lungs filled with fluid. But all other indications were good. His feet and hands were warm, which showed the blood was circulating."

Pawlus regained consciousness the next day and was out of intensive care in four. There have been no

signs of the heart being rejected.

When I came back, I wanted to get out of here. I got up and I was walking out," said Pawlus, who has 25 staples in a foot-long incision through his breastbone. By last Thursday, Pawlus wasn't

feeling disoriented or weak anymore. In fact, he was working out on his exercise bike, climbing stairs, walking and taking in the Tiger game on radio.

HE WAS DUE TO leave the hospital Sunday with doctor's orders to rest for six months and to avoid being near cigarette smoke and flowers. Because Pawlus' residence is attached to the funeral home, he plans to rent an apartment for awhile

"I can't believe how quickly he is recovering," said his nurse, Tammy Malyszek. Pawlus was on 20 medica-

Brown said the requirement for endorsed dipomas - a score of 50 percent - "isn't exactly a high standard. We would hope over the years that schools begin to make changes in the curriculum and begin to move to higher standards.

This is really testing 9th-grade skills. To say graduates who have half of 9th grade skills are ready for the workplace is stretching it a little bit. In some school districts where extremely small percentages have reached requirements, they're scrambling to improve the curriculum and to provide opportunities beyond what they've been doing."
The idea, said Kosteva, "is to try

to bring some accountability into the school systems across the state. People are obviously concerned about the amount of money being spent on



tions. He's down to just 10 anti-re-jection, anti-fungal and blood pressure medicines, his nurse said.

Actually, said Malyszek, heart transplants aren't that risky an operation any more. And while the life expectancy of a transplant patient is 10-15 years, it's increasing all the time.

Cardiomyopathy seems to attack people under stress, she added.

Too few willing to donate

"The most precious gift you can give someone is the gift of life itself. That's exactly what you do by becoming an organ and tissue donor. Yet the simple truth is that there are not enough people who are making this life-giving choice," says Betty Buckley, education director for the Organ Procurement Agency of Michigan.

OPAM is the only organ procurement agency in Michigan. It works in conjunction with the Michigan Eye Bank and handles the procurement of kidneys, hearts, lungs, livers, pancreases, skin and bone

The need for donated organs and tissue is staggering, said Buckley. More than 1,400 Michigan residents and 25,000 people nationwide are waiting for an organ transplant - an all-time high.

"Every 30 minutes, someone new is added to the waiting list," she said. "Unless we can inform our communities and our health care professionals of the need to donate organs and tissues, people will not be given the chance to receive the gift of life."

CURRENTLY, 930 PEOPLE in Michigan are waiting for a kidney. One-hundred eighteen are waiting for hearts. Fifty-six patients need livers. Fourteen are awaiting a pancreas transplant. Waiting for lungs are 16 people. One patient needs a heart and lung transplant. Almost 300 are waiting for cornea transplants.

OPAM designated last week as Organ and Tissue Donor Awareness Week with hopes of increasing dona-

"One organ, if everything can be taken, can help up to 75 people," said Leanne Lesko, transplant coordina-

"We can harvest the major organs, but also the skin, bone and the eyes. The eyes can go into two different individuals. The skin can help severe burn victims by covering up the burn and protecting against infection.

The heart, if not taken for transplant, can be used

for a heart valve transplant." Knowing that a part of themselves or a loved one could be walking around in someone else bothers some people to the point where they elect not to donate. But the families of donors have experienced a rewarding phenomenon, Lesko said.

SHE SAID THE case of Jerry Pawlus of Canton, who recently received the heart of a 17-year-old Oakland County youth, is a case in point.

"The family of the young gentleman who donated has benefited so many from their loss. That has given them so much comfort and peace, knowing they've bettered someone else's life after the life of their loved one has

PEOPLE CAN MAKE things easy on their families by making their wishes regarding organ donation known, said Lesko.

"Your wishes should be known, if you are pro or con. Don't leave your family with this horrible, devastating thing

Available at the Secretary of State's Office are la-bels, which after being filled out and signed by two witnesses, can be used at the time of death to discern which organs may be harvested. Conversely, individuals who don't want to donate their organs can simplify things for health care providers by making that fact known

OPAM is willing to speak to "any community group," said Lesko. "We will talk anywhere, to anyone dies' socials, the Boy Scouts - we do it all.'

Tissues and organs may be recovered from anyone up to 75 years of age. There is no charge. A surgical proceedure is used that has no affect on customary funeral arrangements. It doesn't alter body appearance in any way.



World's biggest

Mobile train display steams into Plymouth

The world's biggest mobile model train display rolled into Plymouth last week, and before it rolls back out on Wednesday, thousands were expected to see it.

"We had this display last January in the city of Taylor, 15,000 people came to see it in two days," recalled Bob Reckinger.

Reckinger, owner of Plymouth Yard and Hobbies in Old Village, arranged for the appearance of "The Magical World of Lionel Trains" display to coincide with a major expan-

sion of his business.

He recently bought, remodeled and opened the former passenger depot and Plymouth yard passenger train office in Old Vilage, just across the tracks from his long time store Starkweather in the former Plymouth freight house.

Admission is \$3 for adults and \$1 for kids under 12.

BESIDES THE LIONEL-sponsored display, the grand opening celebration of the store expansion also features a train ride for kids, rail-road related gifts, food and drink.

'And of course the real trains are always in action on the CSX Rail-road's mainline," Reckinger, said, which runs between the two stores.


The model train display is powered by enough electricity to run two big houses and includes theatrical lighting and sound effects. Viewers can push buttons to animate cranes, control towers and other devices along the track.

Jon Player tours with the exhibit and operates the eight model trains along 500 feet of track. "As it (a train) goes along, it travels through-out the country, from the east coast to the west coast, from the mountains to the desert," he said, motioning to the scenery depicted in the

"The train will go by and a man will pop out of a station, there's more than trains just running in circles," Reckinger said.

THAT'S FOR sure. Along the track are figures including a child flying a kite, occupants of a Thunderbird and Cadillac standing outside their cars after a fender-bender, city streets and old '60s Buicks and Chevy's angle-parked downtown, and a painted sunset.

Walk around the other side of the trailer, and there's a train exiting from a mountain tunnel onto a trestle and through a rural scene, complete with a rowboat lake and a Mail Pouch tobacco ad painted on a barn.

The 46-foot trailer doubles as a display case as its side and rear doors are opened to show the glassenclosed railroad set.

After the display is shown in various locations, "People say they'd like to build their own," Reckinger said, adding, "It's not that easy." A three-dimensional "sky" over

the display with twinkling stars and meteor shower was designed by G&B Optics, lighting consultants to

The exhibit runs through Wednesday, from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day.



Kroger strikers grouse, grumble

Cold-hearted. Indifferent. Hard-to-swal-

That's how Brenda McNeil, a Kroger union steward and assistant customer service manager at the 11 Mile and Middlebelt store, described her employers' "non-reaction" after Nancy Lang, a Livonia cashier, was shot Tuesday afternoon with a paintball gun in front of the store.

'No one from management came out," McNeil said.

Lang could not be reached for comment, but McNeil said she was shaken by the inci-

It's just one more facet of the two weekold United Food and Commercial Workers strike that has upset local strikers as they continue their picketing shifts.

But Michael Layne, a spokesman from Kroger's corporate office in Livonia, said

that he hadn't even heard about the incident

We care and are sensitive to our employees, and want them to return as soon as pos sible," Layne said. "A strike is a difficult sit-

A full-page ad in the daily newspapers Friday, explained Kroger's position on the strike, Layne said.

EIGHTY PERCENT of regular Kroger customers no longer shop at the store, although some have brought coffee and doughnuts to the picket lines, strikers say.

"Other unions, like Blue Cross and the Teamsters, have walked with us," said Gail Trahey, a customer service manager. But, she added, the work stoppage is taking a toll on the strikers.

'A lot of us are the sole support (of our families). What little money we have in the bank, we are using."

and a purpose, you have to strike together." McNeil, who said he's paid \$10.37 an hour,

claims he hasn't received a raise in 11 years. On Wednesday, Kroger management began advertising for temporary replacement workers.

This rankles part-timers like Lisa Jackson, a Farmington Hills resident and Harrison High junior who makes \$4.50 an hour as a clerk-cashier. Jackson's part-time replacement is paid \$7.50, she said.

Jackson, who's been with the company for three years works 24 hours a week. Her mother doesn't support unions and fears for Jackson's safety while picketing, she said.

Part-time employees complain that a two-tier system pays \$10.37 per hour for fulltime employees but \$4.50 to part-timers who do the same kind of work.

AS STRIKERS put in their picket time, they give up their personal lives.
They'd like a little respect, they said.

Court says check lanes violate state constitution SMART eyes sales tax boost

Sobriety check lanes may not violate the U.S. Constitution, but a state Court of Appeals panel says they violate the Michigan Constitu-

"In addition to finding the checkpoints only minimally effective in curbing drunk driving, the trial court found the overall intrusiveness of the road blocks to the citizens to be great," said the 2-1 opin-

Mothers Against Drunk Driving asked state attorney general Frank Kelley to appeal to the state Supreme Court.

THE UNITED States Supreme Court upheld vehicle check lanes under the fourth amendment ("search and seizure") to the U.S. Constitution. But the justices kicked the issue of the Michigan Constitution back to the state

It was the second time in a year ā state Court of Appeals panel reached such a conclusion. Another panel said a woman's right to a state-funded abortion was guaranteed by the "equal benefit" sen-

Stacey and the appeals panel agreed "there is a grave and legitimate state interest in curbing drunk driving, (but) the sobriety checkpoint program did not signifi cantly further that interest and subjectively intruded on individual

The appeals judges added: "We believe compelling reason exists to interpret the Michigan Constitution as affording greater rights than those found in the federal Constitu-

THE OPINION was signed by appellate Judges Gary McDonald and Donald Holbrook.

Dissenting was Judge Roman S. Gribbs, a former Wayne County sheriff and mayor of Detroit.

"Neither the parties nor the ma-jority have pointed to textual differences or to a contrary purpose on the part of our (state) Constitu-tion's framers," Gribbs said.

The U.S. Constitution's fourth amendment says: "The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable search and seizure, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but upon probably cause, supported by an oath or affirmation, and particu-larly describing the place to be searched and the persons or things to be described."

Art. I Sec. 11 of the Michigan Constitution says: "The person, houses, papers and possessions of every person shall be secure from unreasonable searches and seizures. No warrant to search any person or things shall issue without describing them, nor without probable cause, supported by oath or af-

Metro Detroiters will likely be asked to approve a .25-cent sales tax increase to finance mass transit sometime within the next 18 months.

Even though a ballot proposal has et to be drafted, SMART chairman Matt Wirgau of Troy is already campaigning for the regional sales tax

"We think this is something voters will approve," Wirgau said after a Friday appearance before New Detroit Inc.

The regional increase would raise the sales tax to 41/2 cents per dollar, or 90 cents on a \$20 purchase. Of that 90 cents, 5 cents would go to

The proposed tax increase is expected to raise \$65 million per year for regional bus service.

Polls have shown support for a regional transportation tax.

Though the proposal could appear before voters as soon as November, a 1993 vote is also being considered. SMART - the Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation — has enough money to keep op-erating into 1994, Wirgau said.

The sales tax proposal would appear on the ballot in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties. Voters in Monroe and St. Clair counties could

also cast ballots, depending upon whether those counties seek to begin major daily bus routes.

Approval would be based on a simple regional majority, Wirgau said, regardless of whether the tax passed or failed in any individual county.

Taxes would be collected by the state and distributed to the regional mass transit board that would replace suburban-based SMART and the Detroit Department of Transportation.

The proposal's fate will probably depend on whether it can withstand an expected legal challenge and whether SMART can arrange a merger with D-DOT.

A court challenge is considered likely because the state constitution limits the sales tax to 4 percent.

Acting SMART general manager Michael Duggan and former deputy state treasurer Jay Rising are al ready preparing legal arguments, Wirgau said. Arguments are expect-ed to be based upon a transportation tax levied in Wisconsin.

A MERGER WITH D-DOT is still being pursued, though the parties haven't met recently.

Detroit officials are adamant that suburbs must directly pay for mass transit D-DOT is financed through the city operating budget. SMART receives no direct contributions

Controversy has also flared over representation on the proposed governing body. While some suburban officials propose giving the city as little as one-quarter of all delegates—based on overall regional population—city officials want the figure to more closely match ridership. D-DOT carries more than four times as

DOT carries more than four times as many daily passengers as SMART. There also hasn't been agreement on how state and federal transporta-

SMART isn't ruling out a light rail system, Wirgau said, but sees that strictly as a long-term project.

"We think we should first get a viable bus system and replace some of our older buses," he said. "Rails could be somewhere down the road."

It isn't the first time a sales tax increase has been proposed for mass transit. A 1988 SEMCOG plan called for a 1-cent sales tax increase, which would have raised an estimated \$200 million a year. That plan also included two light rail lines.

Wirgau and acting D-DOT director Chris Walton appeared before New Detroit members Friday at a session officially closed to the press. Walton declined comment afterward.










KIDS supporters say plan provides equal opportunity

Michigan's ballot isn't quite full — at least according to the people backing the so-called "Kids Propos-

Petitions are circulating state-wide, seeking to amend the state constitution by promising equality of opportunity for all public school chil-

Backers hope to place the proposal on the November ballot.

"The proposal establishes equality of educational opportunity as a fundamental right," said Carole Sorenson of KIDS, the Ypsilanti-based

group promoting the proposal.

Unlike the governor's "cut and cap" proposal, or the pending Democratic alternative, the Kids Proposal wouldn't itself alter the way schools

But backers hope the guarantee of equal opportunity will translate to more state money, especially for those districts that need it most.

"WE'VE BEEN so heavily dependent on the local property tax that we've forgotten the state has to con-tribute, too," Sorenson said.

In western Wayne, as throughout the state, support is greatest among area in-formula school districts: those that receive state aid for standard school expenses.

Petitions are being widely circulated in the Garden City and Wayne-Westland schools, Sorenson said. They're less heavily circulated in Livonia, Plymouth Canton, South Redford and other out-of-formula districts that receive aid only for specially mandated state programs.

Local supporters include the

Wayne County Regional Educational

Service Agency.
RESA board members approved the Kids Proposal earlier this month,

after rejecting the governor's pro-posal and Democratic alternative.

"The feeling was that in each (of the others) education wouldn't be helped," RESA spokesman Don

RESA supervises special educa-tion and other regional programs on behalf of the county's 34 public school districts.

THE STATE Parent Teacher Organization, Association of School Boards and Association of School Administrators have all endorsed the proposal.

The proposal needs 257,000 signatures by the end of June to appear on the fall ballot.

Backers aren't commenting on how many signatures have been obtained so far, giving fuel to rumors the proposal is in trouble.

Sorenson said she remained confident the deadline would be met.

"There are over 100,000 petitions

circulating," she said.

KIDS — Knowledge is Democracy's Safeguard — is billed as a grassroots organization that began in the Ypsilanti public schools.

Gov. Engler's property tax plan was approved by the Board of State Canvassers last week and will appear on the November ballot.

The proposal would cut school operating taxes 30 percent over a five year period. Operating taxes make up roughly one-third of all property taxes, but exclude school bond issues.

THE ENGLER proposal would also limit yearly assessment increas-es to 3 percent of the rate of infla-tion, if lower. Assesments would rise to current market value upon sale of

the property.
School districts would be reimbursed for losses through expected growth in state revenue. First year taxpayer savings are estimated at \$630 million for homeowners and

Ballot certification for the Democratic alternative was held up pend-ing a challenge from the Michigan Chamber of Commerce.

The Democratic plan would exempt \$30,000 of a home's market value from school operating taxes. For current tax purposes, a home's market value is divided in half, then multiplied against the local millage

Stempien is also a member of the Northville 2000 Committee, helping plan the community's fu-







FAA to hear jet noise complaints

Revised flight patterns for De-oit Metro Airport are too little, too late, for area residents calling

for an entirely new plan.

FAA officials will be in town
April 30 to hear comments on last mmer's 180-day test patterns.

Those patterns — including a fanning out of flights — received generally good reviews from Livo-nia/Dearborn-area residents. But they drew fire from those living south of the airport. Huron Town-ship officials already are suing the Federal Aviation Administration because of the increased flights placed over their community.

Rather than backing last sum-mer's plans, residents are calling for a return to flight patterns in effect before November 1989.

"I'D SAY we're all in agreement

those flight patterns are in every-one's best interest," said Tom Bailey of Livonia, a member of Citizens Against Aircraft Noise-North an affiliate of the Dearborn-based group that first protested jet noise

Citing safety concerns, the FAA in 1989 eliminated many flights over I-94 and replaced them with flights over Dearborn and the

That increased flights over Bailey's southeastern Livonia neighborhood, as well as nearby neighborhoods in Garden City and Westland. Except for the 180-day trial, noise complaints have continued since then.

Bailey has received "20 or 30" calls already this year.

While the FAA is open to suggestions, an agency spokesman couldn't say whether the 1989 flight patterns could return.

'We have been working with

Wayne County for over a year to mitigate noise," said environmen-tal officer Carl Ball of the FAA's Chicago-area regional office

"There was a report published af-ter the 180-day test and it's avail-able in most public libraries in the

The plan calls for changes in runway use and night flight pat-terns, in addition to fanning out flights over a greater number of communities.

Bailey and his fellow group members have seen the report and are disappointed.

"IT LOOKS like all the recommendations were watered down," he said. "It looks like flight patterns are going to change only on perfectly sunny days with tail winds at a certain level."

FAA officials said they're going into the hearing with open minds.
"We're here to develop a plan,"

The hearing is required under the federal Environmental Protection Act.

The public hearing meets 3-8 p.m. at the Ramada Inn Metro Airport, 8270 Wickham, Romulus

Speakers can reserve a time during the first half hour of each hour by calling 942-3792. Speakers may deliver comments during the second half hour of each hour on a first-come, first serve basis.

FAA and county officials will also review the proposal in a workshop setting.

This year Ficano retained the right to fill vacancies on the depart-ment's administrative staff in a county budget dispute.
Ficano has also expanded depart-

ment drug enforcement programs during his past four years in office.

Most recently he has petitioned the county court to make jail space available to pre-trial defendants charged with gun-related offens

Ficano easily outdistanced two challengers in the 1988 Democratic primary. He faced no Republican opposition that fall.

He faces one announced Democratic challenger, county Commissioner Kevin Kelley, D-Redford, this year. Taylor resident Daniel Tackett of the Tisch Independent Citizens Party has also declared himself a

Auditions planned for SC honors recital

Voice repertoire is open to senior high students only, and must be appropriate for this age group. Selections must consist of two contrasting

pieces (for example - one 20th century selection by an American or British composer sung in English and one song or aria including German Lieder, French songs or Italian arts songs.) Pieces must be performed from memory. No music theater. Performance time is three

All contestants in string, guitar or voice repertoire must provide their


own pianist, if needed.

Judges will select a winner from each division and cash prizes will be awarded as follows: strings, junior high, \$150; senior high, \$250; classical guitar, junior high, \$150; senior high, \$250; voice, senior high, 250.

All winners will participate in an open master class with Bossart from 2-4:30 p.m. Sunday, May 10. In addition, the winners will perform in an honor recital at 5 p.m. Sunday, May 17, in the Forum Building Recital Hall at Schoolcraft.

The team was composed of outside specialists in the academic areas, administrative and budgetary teachniques, school plant structure and essential programs such as athletics, the performing arts, media technoloand multi-culturalism

Troy principal Larry Boehms and his multi-cultural committee are doing a good job of addressing the latter issue with staff awareness sessions and student interaction forums. Troy High's five-year outcomes-accreditation plan is an ambitious piece of work, and the school has committed itself to be monitored by the NNNCA team for that period of time. And who was the captain of this champion team? None other than the best high school principal in Michi-


spent on fact-free musings about what other people should do.





Listen to voice of experience

When I graduated from Gabriel Richard High School in Riverview back in 1969, boys never took home economics. I don't think there was ever a rule against it, other than momma saying "God forbid!"

Of course, if memory serves me correctly, momma said the same thing when I announced I was going to pursue a cooking career

Back then, "culinary arts" was nothing more than a glorified chocolate chip baking class with a week of Wilton cake decorating thrown in.

Home ec has long since been replaced by classes now called 'life management," and I often wonder how my life would have have been changed learning about nutrition, home management and budgeting had I not learned it from life's famous "school of hard knocks" and momma's famous "I told you-so's".

EXPERIENCE HAS taught me how to figure square yards after visiting numerous floor covering shops and wallpaper stores and asking for assistance while covering an area "about the size of a full-sized Chevy.

Experience has also taught me about EER's and quick recovery heaters after wondering why I always ran out of hot water during my shower while the dishwasher was running.

Sure, I now use coupons and save almost enough money to make my car insurance payments, but true kitchen economics goes way beyond saving \$20 a week for necessities. Budgeting? Hardly.

One of life's major disappointments was revealed to me last summer when I bought my first "new" set of major kitchen appliances.

Never having owned an automatic ice maker, I was shocked to learn that after installation, my usable freezer space was decreased by almost 40 percent.

FURTHERMORE, WHERE does it say in the book of life that a white kitchen floor shows every drop of pasta sauce and loose cat food "crunchy" that it happens to come in contact with? Little did I know that my kitchen counter required a special cleaner, as do my kitchen cabinets.

As far as I'm concerned, stainless steel sinks belong in a restaurant where they can afford to pay a dishwasher \$4 an hour keep them clean.

Students learn lessons in home economizing

Even though she's still in high school. Donna Morris knows a lot about planning meals and buying groceries.

"The prices are really high, you learn how to make sacrifices. You can't always have what you want. We wanted fresh pineapple, we couldn't have it, we used canned in-

MORRIS, A senior at Stevenson High School in Livonia, learned about grocery shopping and meal planning by doing it in Sheila Garvey's Foods III class.

There are six kitchens in Garvey's classroom. Five students are assigned to each kitchen. They share cooking, cleaning up and serving responsibilities. Each class period is 55 minutes long; students usually cook three of the five days they are in

Garvey teaches five food classes a day, on three different levels. One third of the students are boys.

Recently, Garvey gave each kitch en in her Foods III class \$10, and told them to plan, shop for and cook brunch for eight. She supplied staples like flour and milk.

"WE HAD to find something everyone usually likes, and choose foods from the four main food groups," said Karen Whitmarsh, sophomore, who wants to be a pastry

Whitmarsh and her classmates served chicken stir-fry with vegetables over rice, and homemade almond cookies.

'We did better than we thought," said Angie Ciuffetelli, a sophomore. "We had 53 cents left over. Pea pods were expensive, \$2.99 a pound, so we counted them out to get the amount we needed. We took our time shopping and looked for bargains.

We bought the store brand rice, found red peppers marked down, and got boneless chicken breasts on special for \$1.99 a pound. We went to two different stores to get what we

"A lot of parents don't know how to make food," said Garvey. "The dinner conversation at home is often 'what did you learn in foods class today?' The parents are learning too."

Garvey doesn't use any mixes or prepared foods in her classes. Pots of oregano, rosemary, basil, chives and thyme line the front of her desk. The basil was almost picked clean. Last week the students made pasta sauce and used it. She also teaches students how to freeze and can fruits and vegetables.

"We live off our canning all year. In the spring we'll make strawberry jam, in the fall we'll make grape jelly and can tomatoes, pears or peaches.'

COOKING CLASS isn't a piece of cake, students in Garvey's classes

words. "I have high expectations, and I expect perfection," she said. Students have homework assignments. "They have to make white

bread and a pie crust at home."

In Foods I students learn how to make chocolate chip cookies, quick breads, casseroles and pizza. Foods II features cooking with herbs and spices, canning and a field trip to Food Emporium on Six Mile in Livonia where they learn about meat. Foods III students learn about cooking with appliances and foods from

foreign countries. Students also learn from guest chefs like Steve Smith who showed

them how to use a pasta machine. "I stress home cooking," said Garvey. "I tell them to cook for people you love, and that love you, and you will do a better job."

FAVORITE **CHICKEN NUGGETS**

Easy to make, these crunchy nuggets are full of flavor and take only minutes to prepare.

Because chicken breasts vary in size, this recipe makes enough coating for 12-14 nuggets.

3 tablespoons margarine, melted 2 whole chicken breasts, skinned boned and cut into chunks 1 % cups coarsely crushed saltine cracker crumbs ¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese

1/2 package dry ranch dressing honey or ketchup for dipping

Dip chicken in melted margarine and toss to coat.

In a plastic bag, combine cracker crumbs, Parmesan cheese and ranch dressing.

Place a few chicken pieces at a time into the bag, close the bag tightly and shake firmy to coat

Place the chicken pieces in a single layer on a lightly greased baking sheet.

Bake in a 450 degree oven for 7-9 minutes or until the chicken is no longer pink.

HOMEMADE POTATO CHIPS Scrub clean and thinly slice medium baking potatoes.

In a deep frying pan or sauce pan, heat 2 cups vegetable oil and fry one sliced potato at a time for 5-6 minutes or until the slices are crisp and golden brown.

Remove them with a slotted spoon and place on paper towels to drain. Season lightly with salt.

> MARINATED VEGETABLE SALAD

1 cup broccoli, cut into bite-sized pieces 1 cup cauliflower, cut into bitesized pieces 1 cup carrots, sliced bottled Italian salad dressing

Marinate the vegetables in salad dressing two hours or more.

Refrigerate and serve chilled. For vegetables that are slightly softer and a little bit easier to eat, either microwave them for five minutes or steam them until they are crunchy-tender.

VANILLA PUDDING

Well, it's April so it's probably raining or snowing outside and, for some reason, watching the sit-coms on Channel 50 doesn't sound as interesting as it usually does. So what are you going to do with yourself?

Have some fun, of course. And, being the vigilant amusement pursuer that I am, I've gone to great trouble of previewing some diversions for all of you music-loving media children out there. Here are three vaguely music-related pursuits that you might want to check out:

Play It By Ear — The First CD Game: This game is the "Trivial Pursuit" of the 1990s and for good reason. It's a heck of a lot like "Trivial Pursuit."

As the name implies, the game has something to do with CDs. "Hit Men" (Fredric Dannen, Vintage Books, 1990): If you've ever wondered how in the heck a song like "I Wanna Be a Cowboy" (by Boys Don't Cry, if you're a trivia buff) ever became a big hit, let alone even made it to the airwaves, you'll find all the answers in this revealing little book. The answer in a word -

'Hit Men" is a behind-the-scenes look at the settling inner workings of the music business. Dannen explains how record companies have huge budgets set up to pay the folks who can make sure certain songs get played on the radio.

In the past, it was as simple as that - pay for play. But since the publication of the book, things are looking up. Radio is no longer the only force to be reckoned with and the payola tradition may die a natu-

Hits by radio-shunned artists like Enya, Metallica and Nirvana may shake things up enough so the people

will finally get to choose what makes it and what doesn't.

"All You Need to Know About the Music Business" (Donald S. Passman, Prentice Hall Press, 1991): This book is a must for fledgling musicians and a good read for people who are interested in the music biz.

Passman, an entertainment attorney, focuses on the legal side of the business and talk about the various ways that record companies can weasel money out of their artists.

For example, guess who pays for those glitzy record company record release parties? The artist. The expensive catered food backstage? The

You get the idea. Armed with this primer, you'll be ready to negotiate with style in no time.

Machines mix techno, emotion

On their self-titled debut album, Machines of Loving Grace cut a swath through the genres of hard-core techno, thumping funk and pastoral acoustic guitar pieces

In their wake, lead vocalist Scott Benzel wants to meld a sound from debris left behind.

"This record was an experimental process from the beginning," Benzel said. "Essentially, it was Mike (Fisher, keyboardist), Stuart (Kupers, guitarist) myself in the studio trying to define our

They're bored, quite frankly.

At least with the direction industrial music has taken in the last few years. Electronically driven bands such as Skinny Puppy and Nine-Inch Nails are veering off into their own domain while those left behind are myopically mass-producing repetitive, multi-beat dirges

Machines of Loving Grace obviously refuse to get caught in the vortex. Their direction continually spins like a weather vane during a dust

If a common thread does pierce the band's ninesong course on Mammoth Records it's Machines of Loving Grace's way of turning cold, hard rhythms into sensual, glowing numbers.

This reveals itself in overt fashion on the shimmering acoustic guitar piece "Ciccolina" or amorously driven funk of "Rite of Shiva."

YET THE sampling in number "Content" and the drum machine beats in "Terminal City" don't

construct electronic impenetrable walls of sound Instead, technotronics offer an uneasy bridge be-tween machine precision and human fallibility.

"There's always a tension occurring between the two," Benzel said. "We like electronics a lot the songs. On the other hand, a lot of hard techno stuff is pretty devoid of human intellect and emo-

"What we try to do is add those things." On this tour, Machines of Loving Grace has added drummer Brad Kemp and bassist Andrew Stewart to accentuate the human element of the their music. The band's sound has always contained an amiable personality, though.

Kupers' guitar playing can be psychedelic to plaintive while Fisher's keyboards circulate

through the whole body of music rather than bludgeoning it through the ground.

Then there's Benzel's vocals, which can reveal fascination and vulnerability, as opposed to uttering chants to march in cadence to.

Lyrically, Benzel said he's inspired by lines from a novel or a movie. "Rite of Shiva," for example, was derived from a passage in a Robert Anton Wilson novel about a cult ritual.

THE SONG caught the attention of Nine-Inch Nails creator Trent Reznor, who might produce the band's next album. In the interim, Reznor remixed Machine's of Loving Grace's "Burn Like Brilliant Trash (At Jackie's Funeral)," a rather ornery lament about the death of the American

dream inspired by John F. Kennedy's Camelot. Reznor's four versions of the same number radiate the anger, creating a visceral tombstone for the vision held in the '60s.

'You'll notice the chorus is really stripped down compared to our version," Benzel said. "He just stripped it down and strengthened it a lot. He got some harder sounds in theirs, they've got ne drum riffs going. He also added a bit to it that is subtle but adds a nice feel to it. We feel it fit the core of the song.

As for the song, "Rite of Shiva," that initially attracted Reznor to Machine's of Loving Grace?
"I don't why he liked it," Benzel said. "Maybe

he thought it was demented.'

Grazing in tuneful 'pasture'

The Holy Cows are very much a Midwestern band. What, you ask, constitutes such as distinction?

Well, a Midwest address helps for starters. From there, it's open to interpretation really.

THEIR SECOND nationwide release, a nine-song offering, is an expedition down a dirt road, creating a timeless and pastoral mood. The title track "Get Along" thumps along languidly and speaks to the heart of a broken relationship.

Feeney, who writes the lyrics for the Holy Cows, said the three-minute number is his favorite on the album.

"I wrote it while going through a difficult period of getting over a dif-

ficult relationship," Feeney said. "It was one of those turbulent things where you can't understand why it happened . . . It (the song) made it easier to understand what I couldn't understand.

Which was? "Really what it boiled down to is we didn't get along. You can't attribute it to anyone particular circumstance. It's just a fact itself. "I don't think it's going to replace

Plato or anything."
The Holy Cows didn't set out nearly five years ago to replace Greek philosophy. Rather, the band simply wanted to play unadorned rock'n'roll passionately and forcefully. Initially, drummer Mike Popovich

said the Replacements were an influence - but not anymore.

"They've gotten worse," Popovich said. "We've gotten better." THE HOLY COWS of late have be-

come somewhat enthralled with the 70s Southern rock of the Allman Brothers and Lynyrd Skynyrd as well as roots music, such as bluegrass and country, according to Po-

Only in the number "We Never Waltz," a country twang-drenched number, do those influences fully reveal themselves.

Altman stabs Hollywood in his brilliant 'Player'

Taking jabs at the crassness of Hollywood has always been like shooting fish in a barrel. Ever since ia's Harry Cohn in the 1930s. the studio mogul has been typified as a cigar-chomping dictator with absolutely no taste or integrity.

"The Player," the latest from Robert Altman, brilliantly updates the Tinseltown story. Here, Tim Robbins plays Griffin Mill, a senior vice president of production at a major studio. Tall, slightly boyish in his expensive tailored suits, he is wise to all the angles, including rumors that someone is after his job.

To make matters worse, a disgruntled writer has been sending threatening postcards to Mill. Sifting through records of the hundreds of writers he brushes off every month, he narrows the names down to one and cagily confronts him at a screening of "The Bicycle Thief."

From here, "The Player" takes an audience on so many surprising twists and turns that it would be a sin to reveal much more about the plot. It opens this weekend at the Maple, although word is already out following a nearly sold-out benefit



screening at the Michigan Theatre in

It's certainly no secret that countless big-name actors and actresses have walk-ons in the film. They practically stood in line to work with Altman when they heard that his next project would tackle the stu-

At restaurants, parties, bars, and studio offices, you'll see such famil-iar faces as Susan Sarandon, Cher, Nick Nolte, Anjelica Huston, Bruce Willis, Jack Lemmon, Peter Falk, Lily Tomlin, John Cusack, Harry Belafonte and Julia Roberts, just to

MORE THAN just name-dropping. they provide a realistic element that takes you so close to the business of making movies that you'll complete-

ly forget that you're watching one. Many have the chance to take many have the chance to take their own pokes at the type of studio executive represented by Mill. Malcolm McDowell corners Mill in a hotel lobby. Burt Reynolds greets him congenially and then talks about him behind his back.

Other character actors take on roles, including Dean Stockwell as one in a series of pushy writers. Whoopi Goldberg is a police detec-tive and Fred Ward is the head of studio security. Recording artist Lyle Lovett makes his film debut as a mysterious man who may be on the executive's trail.

Peter Gallagher, the faithless husband from "sex, lies, and videotape," has the best in a string of memorable lines. As the up-and-coming young exec hot for Mill's job, he's on

"I didn't know you were an al-

coholic," Mill says.

"I'm not," the young player replies. "But that's where all the best deals are getting made lately."

Perhaps the biggest star in "The Player" is Michael Tolkin. You may not recognize his cameo as a young writer with yet another pitch for Mill, but he wrote the brilliant screenplay for this film, based on his novel. He has a perfect ear for Hollywood-speak.

TOLKIN WAS determined not to deliver yet another story of a young writer struggling to hold onto his in-tegrity in the studio system (see "Barton Fink" and "City of Angels"). The picture he paints is full of gray areas, especially concerning Mill, who has at least two moments where he can be likable despite all the cut-throat wheeling and dealing.

Director Altman, meanwhile, adds clever homages to films' past. The opening scene, which lasts several minutes in one continuous shot, re-calls Orson Welles' opening from "Touch of Evil." One of the charac-

ters even makes a reference to it.

When the plot thickens and you don't know who is after Mill, the camera lingers on a photograph of Alfred Hitchcock.

Since his early successes with "M.A.S.H" and "Nashville" in the 1970s, Robert Altman has had a love-hate relationship with Holly-wood. His films have been made outside the studio system whenever possible and, until now, have failed to attract wide audiences

"The Player" has the potential to make more money than all of his other films put together. It will appeal to both fans of the director's work and those hooked on the inside scoop dished out nightly on "Entertainment Tonight." Whatever category you fall into, see this film soon before you hear too much more

'Object of Beauty' is disappointment

don restaurant, the well-dressed man makes the sign of the cross over his credit card before he hands his plastic to the waiter. That scene opens "The Object of Beauty" a rather disappointing social commen-tary directed and written by Michael

John Malkovich plays the man, who argues that there must have been a computer error after his card is rejected at the restaurant. Most the personal check he convinced the restaurant to take will bounce like a rubber ball. It seems Malkovich is financially overextended, all of his money being tied up in cocoa that can't get out of Sierra Leone thanks to a strike by local

That hasn't stopped Malkovich and his girlfriend, played by Andie MacDowell, from continuing to live in the high style to which they are accustomed. Ensconced in a luxury hotel suite they can't afford, the pair's credo is "When it comes to food, shoes and sex, money is no ob-

object as the hotel starts discreetly pressing for its money, credit cards reach their limit and the cocoa starts getting tossed into the ocean by those angry dock workers in Sier-

ra Leone. The more obvious courses of action, like cutting expenses or getting a job, never occur to this couple.

Instead, they focus on a small bronze Henry Moore statue Mac-Dowell received as a gift from her husband, played in a couple brief scenes by Peter Riegert. MacDowell suggests stashing her statue with a friend and reporting it stolen, giving their cash flow a jump start with an insurance settlement

Malkovich proposes selling the "Object of Beauty" to raise some oney but MacDowell doesn't want to part with it. When the statue mys teriously disappears, the couple start suspecting each other.

As a comedy, the film has a few humorous moments, most supplied by Bill Paterson as the hotel detective trying to locate the statue. There are a few glimpses that Malkovich's character realizes his own shallowness and the superficialness of his life, but it's never really devel-

The couple is unremittently selfcentered and manipulative, even to the point of Malkovich romancing MacDowell's best friend after he thinks she has hidden the statue.

THE FILM really doesn't work at all as a mystery since its immediately clear who took the statue and

performance comes from Rudi Davies, a pale sad-faced deaf mute who works at the hotel as a maid. She lives in a small run-down flat with a brother. Perhaps the only comment Lindsay-Hogg successfully makes with the film is on the true value of beauty and art.

Malkovich sees the statue as a source of cash; MacDowell has a sentimental attachment. The brother and his small time criminal cronie don't see any value in the work until the insurance company offers a reward

As for the maid, her reaction speaks to the essential quality of art and beauty.

"It spoke to me," she says of the



Early spring, when the azalea and wisteria embroider the elegant grid of downtown squares of Savannah, Ga., may be the best season to visit one of the South's most historic

Founded in 1733, Savannah began as a rather audacious vision - a attempt to create a vibrant urban environment built around a symmetrical network of urban squares out of Georgia swampland.

Today the city is still a work in progress. It has not gone as far as neighboring Charleston in putting all the pieces together, but its inviting urban geometry, rich sense of history and compact downtown make it an exceptionally inviting

This is a good time of year, before the summer heat really sets in, to explore Savannah on foot.

There are at least four focal points for visitors: the restored waterfront, scene of music and arts exhibits the first Saturday of each month; the leafy grid of squares full of intriguing architecture and history; the restored City Market, where old warehouses have been restored into restaurants and shops; and Tybee Island, 18 miles east of downtown Savannah, which offers beaches, fishing and boating for those who have had their fill of downtown.

For a city its size, Savannah has an extraordinarily rich selection of inns and hotels to choose from. Repeat visitors who have liked where they've stayed in the past

would do well to take a chance on another place they might like even

EVENTS

One of the best sunset views can be found as part of the Candle Lantern Tour of the Tybee Lighthouse, at 30 Meddin Drive. Held May 1 and the first Friday of June, July and August, the tour goes to the top of Georgia's oldest (1773) and tallest (15 feet) lighthouse.

The tour is \$3; \$2 for children aged 6 to 12. The lighthouse is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; closed Tuesday. Admission is \$1.50; 50 cents for children. For more information call (912) 786-5801.

The waterfront is the focus for a number of events all year. On May 2, and the first Saturday of every month, the First Saturday Festival offers food and crafts booths from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

On May 9 and 10 is the annual Arts on the River Festival with music by arts organizations and groups throughout the city, ranging from classical to jazz and folk. There is no charge for either.

Also downtown is the annual free Shakespeare on the Square. This year the City Lights Theater is presenting "The Comedy of Errors May 1 to 3 on Telfair Square.

At the Telfair Academy of Arts and Sciences, at 121 Barnard St., selections from the academy's collection of American paintings, drawings, prints and sculpture continues to June 21.

Until June 14, the museum will display "The Cutting Edge:

Contemporary American Folk Art," a collection of work by 20 folk artists. For more information call

SIGHTSEEING

You don't need a tour guide to see Savannah. All you need is a sturdy pair of walking shoes and a good guidebook. For the latter the best source for reading material on the city is E. Shaver, Bookseller, at 326 Bull St., on Madison Square. Call (912) 234-7257.

The best way to wander around is to view each square as a discrete community with its own personality. Johnson Square is the city's commercial center, with symbols of power ranging from the major banks to the commanding Christ Church. Madison Square may be the most

vibrant, full of students from the Savannah College of Art and Design. Troup Square feels the most like a friendly neighborhood park.

Be sure to meander over to Forsyth Park, with its moss-draped oaks and riot of spring color, and to Colonial Park Cemetery, Oglethorpe Avenue and Abercorn Street, with its weathered headstones and

monuments dating to Colonial days. For those interested in a tour, one of the most popular is the two-hour excursion along the waterfront and historic district with Green Trolley Tours. The price is \$8.50; \$5 for

Flexibility key for seniors

Stretching necessary for golfers

A disciplined routine of stretching is the most important factor in enabling senior-citizen golfers to avoid injuries and enjoy their sport more completely.

About 60 people, most of them seniors, heard a three-man panel of medical and golf experts offer that advice and other knowledge Thursday evening at the Farmington Area YMCA.

The program was sponsored by the Total Rehabilitation and Athletic Conditioning Center in conjunction with ElderMed at Botsford General Hospital in Farming-

Shel Levine of TRACC, Dr. Stephen Goldman and retired PGA golfer Bob Szilagyi shared their individual expertise, with the need for proper conditioning being central to each of their talks.

Levine, who holds a master's degree in clinical exercise physiology, asked 'How many people think golf is good exercise?' About twothirds raised their hands. 'How many ride a cart?' A handful raised their hands again.

"GOLF IS GOOD exercise if you walk," he said. "Age is no road-block to get in shape. Everyone can

do some type of aerobic exercise."

The principle of being in shape and loose applies to all age groups but is especially important for seniors and can actually slow down the aging process, according to Goldman, a specialist in sports and osteopathic medicine at Botsford.

As people get older, muscles begin to change at age 25, the heart beat at peak exercise level decreases a little each year, blood pressure goes up before peaking around 70, there is less water in the body and it takes longer to warm up and cool down after physical activity.

Most golfers go to the putting green to "warm up," Levine said, but their warm-up routine should involve walking around the putting green instead.

An aerobic activity and static stretching — holding the stretch for 20-30 seconds at a time — are advised. Stretching can take care of a lot of joint aches and pain, according to Goldman.

Levine demonstrated several exercises golfers can do to loosen their muscles in the neck, arms,

torso and lower back. They should be done the year round and not just before golfing, he said.

"Get in condition for your sport; don't use your sport to get in condition," Levine said. "Good cardiovascular conditioning will help you finish nine holes."

DEHYDRATION during a round of golf also is very common, according to Levine, and seniors need to be especially careful.

The signs of dehydration are profuse sweating, pale and clammy skin, elevated body temperature, loss of motor coordination and faintness. If a person feels dehydrated, he/she should find shade, lie down, elevate the feet and drink cold liquid.

Levine and Goldman cautioned their listeners not to drink alcohol before or while playing golf, adding a caffeinated drink like coffee can be just as bad. To prevent dehydration, golfers should also drink a lot of water before going out and either avoid hot days or get

acclimated to them.
"Drinking alcohol is the worst

thing you can do on a 90-degree day." Levine said.

Elbow pain and low-back strain are common ailments that afflict golfers, Goldman said. The former is an inflammation of the inside of the arm caused by striking the ground with the club, usually resulting in a large divot.

"The jamming sensation causes problems with the neck and shoulder," Goldman said, adding the latter is often caused by overswing-

ing.

Most of the aches and pains golfers have can be treated at home. If a problem persists for more than a week, the individual should have it checked unless swelling and excessive pain require immediate care.

OTHERWISE, ICE should be applied for three days. Goldman was emphatic about his Three-Day Rule. Never use anything but ice to treat a sore area during the first three days. Moist heat can be used after that.

"Ice and stretching will get you out of 99 percent of all problems you have," Goldman said, adding golfers can avoid injuries by paying attention to the mechanics of their swing.

Szilagyi, now the teaching pro at Salem Hills Golf Club in Washtenaw County, demonstrated proper technique and its role in preventing injuries.

"You're less prone to injury by using the legs in the golf swing," he said. "Most golfers want to use their arms and shoulders because that's what they're used to doing relative to other activities. You want to use your whole body but in the right sequence.

"People use their legs but use them too late. Most don't get enough shoulder turn and then won't use their legs. If you don't get the weight back, how are you going to get it forward properly? If you leave the weight forward and don't get it back, you have no power."

Szilagyi added tempo is important in executing the backswing, the knees should be flexed to use the legs in generating power and the grip should be light as a feather.

Tackett among leading hitters despite injury

Denice Tackett postponed knee reconstructive surgery in order to continue her softball career at the University of Detroit-Mercy.

Tackett, playing in her final year of college eligibility, hasn't let a

knee brace slow her down.

The 1987 Plymouth Salem graduate is rated among the top three in the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in hitting (.397), RBI (17), doubles (five) and triples (one) for the Titans, who are 17-4 overall and 5-3 in the MCC.

Tackett could have had surgery prior to the season but chose to wait until the summer after hearing it might require a nine-month rehabilitation period.

TACKETT, A first-team MCC choice last year, blew out the interior cruciate of her knee as a sophomore in 1989. She had scope surgery then, was red-shirted and earned a fifth year of eligibility.

Tackett calls herself the "sole survivor" of the '87 recruiting class, since the other five either left U-D-Mercy early or ran out of eligibility. One of the '87 recruits, Jackie Pitts, ended her career last year as one of the nation's stolen base leaders.

"It's pretty sad (ending a career) and been kind of a disappointing year because I'm used to playing so many more games," said Tackett, referring to the several games postponed because of bad weather. "The knee is sore and it slows me down a lot, but I feel I can still compete at the same level. It's going to be different not playing. I've been there five years and I've seen the team go through tremendous changes."

Tackett was a member of the MCC champion in '88 and '89 and last year she played on a second-

softball

place team. The Titans are playing for first-year coach Laura Mueller, who took over for Nick Stanns, fired despite being MCC coach of the year in '91.

TACKETT SAID she enjoyed playing for Stann but the change was for the better. Stann had only one losing season in eight years.

Linda Jarvey and Kim Wiseman are the current assistant coaches.

"It's an improvement over last year because the team is more comfortable around the coaches," Tackett said. "The coaches last year were very hard on us, discipline-wise. I feel the team will improve through the years and have a shot at the NCAA Tournament. Our goal now is to win the MCC again."

The MCC tournament is being held May 12-13 in Indianapolis and the Titans figure to challenge for the championship along with Notre Dame, the defending champ. The Titans have one of the better defenses in the MCC to go with pitcher Teresa Emery (0.00 ERA in her first seven games), but they are aware of the league's continued improvement.

"In the MCC there are no teams you can say you're definitely going to beat them," Tackett said. "The teams seem to be getting tougher every year. Before there was not enough competition. Everything is laid out on the line in the tournament. You either win or you don't."

Tackett, who carries a 2.8 grade

Tackett, who carries a 2.8 grade point average while majoring in physical education and minoring in health education, will graduate next December after student teaching.

Another TV season ends:

Who's left standing?

Series change, switch networks, say farewell

For television critics, the constant influx of hype is a little deadening. Whether it's a "groundbreaking new drama series" or an "innovative comedy concept," it seems it's all been said before.

Yet the end of this season, and its implications for the next, deserves to stand out in the mind of viewer and pundit alike. It is surely unprecedented for a single season's passing to bring so many changes, adjustments and ends

Many didn't believe Bill Cosby when he declared this would be the last season for the still highly rated "Cosby Show." but end it did, taking a final, exultant bow on Thursday, April 30, with son Theo Huxtable's college graduation. Just five days earlier. ABC bid farewell to three of its prime-time mainstays: "Growing Pains." "Who's the Boss?" and 'MacGyver" Each of the formentioned series leaves a noticeable hole in the schedule, but none more so than "Cosby," which had never strayed from its Thursday night opening berth, even when challenged by Fox's "The Simpsons" in later years.

This Saturday marks the conclusion of another NBC staple and one long regarded as the linchpin of that network's comedic domination of Saturday night: "The Golden Girls " In the final episode,

Dorothy (Bea Arthur) decides to play a joke on her roommates and feign romance with a handsome widower (Leslie Nielsen). The plan backfires when real love sets in and the couple decides to marry.

But the story won't stop as the honeymoon starts. Next season, Rue McClanahan, Betty White and Estelle Getty will re-create their characters in a new show on another network. Titled "Golden Palace," the CBS series will have the ladies installed as proprietors of a hotel. Word is that Arthur will visit from time to time.

Also jumping from NBC (after being dropped by that network) to CBS is Carroll O'Connor's "In the Heat of the Night," but the format is unclear; originally announced as six two-hour movies, it now appears "Heat" will show up in a regular weekly berth. Another hit waving goodbye to the Peacock network is 'Matlock," which relocates to ABC Star Andy Griffith has been openly resentful of his former employers' claims that he didn't draw younger viewers in sufficient numbers and equally grateful for the new lease on network life.

At least two spin-offs are penciled in for next season. "Melrose Place" is a new address from the producers of Fox's "Beverly Hills, 90210," who are this time aiming for a slightly older audience. (In other words,

"90210" fans who've received their diplomas.) Grant Show stars as Jake Hanson, a construction worker who lives in the same apartment complex as many of his "twentysomething" friends. On CBS, Nell Carter will star as a nononsense bail bondswoman in an asvet-unnamed comedy spin-off from 'Jake and the Fatman." That series. incidentally, is also leaving the air, reportedly because stars William Conrad and Joe Penny aren't interested in returning

CBS' popular "Designing Women" will be back next year but without Julia Duffy, whose whining Allison proved unpopular with viewers. Rumor has it that former regular Jean Smart, who left the series to spend more time with her children, may return for periodic visits, and Jackee will come aboard the show late this year as Meshach Taylor's new love interest. Jackee also has a regular role on CBS' "The Royal Family" but if that series fails, she could join "Women" full time.

So what does it all mean? When so many popular series are judged to have run their course, are there replacements with genuine potential waiting in the wings? Will those replacements break new ground and bypass the cliches that plagues prime time, or will they be palid imitations of the programs they replace? And when next season comes, with so many new shows on the schedule, will the programming execs be more inclined to give those new entries a fighting chance? As the song says, " .. see you in September






