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Primary will decide board race



Seven candidates will fight it out in the Aug. 4 Republican primary election for four seats on the Plymouth Township board of trustees. There are no Democratic challengers. The WTUA sewer project controversy will likely be a campaign issue.

Plymouth Township Republicans are usually a quiet lot, but not this year.

In the race for four four-year terms to the township board of trustees, there are seven candidates.

This year, only two incumbent trust-

tees are seeking re-election. Five challengers — all with strong background in either community service or business and all expressing a strong desire to serve — are also vying for a seat on the township board.

Add to the race the controversy over the Western Townships Utilities Au-

thority project. It was created to free local residents from the rates charged by the Detroit water board for water and sewer services.

But when some WTUA contracts were let without seeking bids, charges of cronyism followed.

The four top vote getters of the field of seven will survive the Aug. 4 Republican primary. They are virtually assured election in November because there are no Democratic candidates.

The candidates for trustee are:

• Kay Arnold, 53, business manager

for Colonial Collision and director with the Community Federal Credit Union and Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce. She stresses a strong financial background, integrity and honesty.

• Charles Curmi, 37, a lifelong Plymouth Township resident who is an automotive development supervisor. He stresses an ability to gather information and make reasoned decisions to tackle issues.

Activist 'fought city hall' on airport issue

Warren Dusbiber showed you could fight city hall — and win.

Dusbiber, 70, who helped organize citizens' opposition to public ownership of Mettetal Airport in Canton Township, died early Saturday from an apparent heart attack, friends said.

He celebrated his 70th birthday the day before.

"If it hadn't been for Warren Dusbiber, the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township would own an airport right now," said Dennis Shrewsbury, Plymouth city commissioner who opposed the airport purchase effort as a commission candidate.

"He taught people that they could fight city hall," Shrewsbury said.

City set to hire DDA boss

The city of Plymouth is finishing an agreement to hire its first Downtown Development Authority (DDA) Director.

After receiving 163 applications and narrowing the field to 10, the city DDA

picked Stephen Guile, of Dowagiac, as its first choice to fill the newly created position, said Steve Walters, Plymouth City Manager.

Salary for the position is in the \$40,000 range, according to Walters. The city and Guile are negotiating his first year salary and a relocation allowance. Walters anticipates an agreement by the end of this week and to hire Guile by Aug. 1.

The Plymouth DDA made the decision to hire a full time director because the tasks of the group were getting too large to be handled on a part time basis, according to Larry Bird, owner of Country Charm and a member of the Plymouth DDA.

The downtown development district was established in 1983. It's an area of downtown Plymouth bordered by Wing Street on the south, Harvey on the west, Church Street on the north, and Union, Deer on the east, and a few additional parcels.

The creation of the district enables the DDA to capture taxes from properties within the district boundaries and invest that money into downtown, by state law.

Under the current leadership of the Plymouth DDA, the board established a list of projects it would like to accomplish downtown. With the DDA working at these projects on a part time basis, the projects couldn't be completed, according to Bird.

As part of the DDA, Bird put on a business seminar in February, attended by approximately 125 "I spent between 200 and 300 hours (preparing that seminar)," said Bird. "Business owners can't take that much time away from their business."

The DDA board felt it was necessary to hire a full time director to accomplish its goals.

1 killed, 4 hurt in head-on crash

A Farmington Hills man was killed and four people injured Tuesday night when a driver fleeing an accident in Plymouth Township collided head-on with a second car at Schoolcraft and Eckles in Livonia, police said.

Killed was a 23 year old, front seat passenger in the second car, a 1985 Buick Skylark headed west-bound on Schoolcraft.

Police on Wednesday declined to identify the victim, saying relatives hadn't been notified.

The victim wasn't wearing a safety belt, police said.

The driver and two additional passengers in the Buick, as well as the driver of the fleeing car, a 1988 Oldsmobile Cutlas, were injured in the 8:30 p.m. accident, said Sgt. Kevin Dawley of the Livonia Police Department traffic bureau.

The injured included a 20-year old Livonia man and two Northville residents, 24 and 25, all in the

'Eli and Denny' can't bear to wrestle; show to go on

Caesar the wrestling bear's appearance Thursday at a Canton Township saloon has been seared by controversy, but the show will go on.

Celebrity wrestlers Denny McClain and Eli Zaret cancelled their participation in the wrestling event when Channel 2 officials were bombarded with protest letters from the group People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals.

McClain and Zaret's matchup with Caesar was to be used on an upcoming segment of the "Eli and Denny Show," according to a

spokesman for the station.

The show will go on, however, with Caesar taking on members of the audience at the Urban Cowboy Saloon.

The 900-pound black bear is owned by World Animal Studios of Columbia Station, Ohio. Owner and trainer Sam Mazzola bills his business as "educational entertainment exhibitions." He travels throughout the region with Caesar participating in wrestling events and doing educational programs.

"It is educational for people to see the bear up close and to touch him. When would most people ever get a chance like that?" Mazzola said.

The event was set to mark the grand opening of the saloon located in the old Center Stage building on Ford Road one block east of I-275. A portion of the cover charges were to go to the Muscular Dystrophy Association.

The evening is also set to feature matches with "eight of Michigan's biggest bar bouncers," according to saloon owner John Sassak.

Mazzola maintains that Caesar is treated quite well. He travels in an air conditioned trailer and there are rules that are enforced to ensure the safety of the bear as well as his opponents in the ring.

People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals claim that Caesar's

teeth and claws have been humanely removed, and that he bit the fingers off of one of his opponents.

"Where is there proof?" Mazzola asks.

He said Caesar has all of his teeth and claws and has never injured anyone.

"I have had the same insurance carrier for five years and I have never had a claim filed against me," Mazzola said.

Patrons who are able to pin Caesar will win a \$1,000 cash prize Thursday night.

The 1,000-pound bear is not muzzled, according to Mazzola. Caesar

was born in captivity 10 years ago in Wisconsin. He is the fifth generation of a captive black bear family. The trainer said Channel 2 director Jeff Forster has agreed to attend

the event Thursday evening and if he finds everything in order the match with Zaret and McClain will be rescheduled for next month. Doors open at 6:30 p.m.

• Carol Davis, 48, a former teacher who has served on the Plymouth Canton schools board of education and as head of the Plymouth District Library board. She cites experience on public boards, saying she can work with people to solve problems.

Guile will have an office in downtown Plymouth, but the site hasn't been finalized. According to Bird, the DDA wants him downtown, so he is close to the merchants, but not housed in city hall.

Guile sees his new position as a "liaison between city government and the retail sector."

Guile was the DDA director in Dowagiac for the last four years.

A 1975 graduate of Michigan State University, Guile has 14 years of retail experience, working as a store manager and a regional manager. He also was a special coordinator for the 1980 Republican National Convention in Detroit, and has worked in media, media sales and as a disc jockey.

Guile, his wife Joann, and their three children, Jason, 14, Saman-

tha, 10, and Sarah, 4, are coming to Plymouth from the west side of the state, but are no stranger to this community and surrounding areas. His wife's family lives in Livonia and he and his family often visited Plymouth.

Guile's goal in his new position is to "try to help business owners understand their markets. People open a business and automatically feel they'll be successful," said Guile. "They have to know the market (and its) limitations." With his diverse background, he hopes to help business owners to promote themselves, narrow their target markets if necessary, and to maximize the market in the area.

But before making any specific goals, Guile wants to check out the city and market more specifically.

"Warren was really the father of the Plymouth Township Concerned Citizens," said Robert Zaetta, a co-founder of the group.

"He was the one who first noticed the township was going to buy an airport," Zaetta said. Dusbiber got citizens in the city and township together to meet to oppose the effort and took reams of notes and made tapes of government meetings where the airport issue was discussed.

In the face of strong citizen opposition, the Plymouth Township government got together with Canton to seek federal grants to buy the airport, abandoning an earlier effort to seek those grants with the city of Plymouth.

Some observers saw the move as an attempt to abandon the airport purchase, as federal officials have been asked to approve restrictions

some say they are unlikely to approve.

The Federal Aviation Administration has yet to notify Canton and Plymouth Township if the grant application will be approved.

Dusbiber was born July 10, 1922, in Ypsilanti. He was a chemical engineer with Burroughs Corp., retiring in 1981. He was a member of the St. Andrew Episcopal Church in Livonia.

Survivors include wife Lois, sons, Darryl of Ypsilanti and Brian of St. Paul, Minn., a daughter, Wendy Porter of Canton, and six grandchildren.

Funeral services were Monday at the Vermilion Funeral Home in Plymouth. The Rev. Robert Clapp officiated. Burial was Wednesday at Highland Cemetery, Ypsilanti.

Buick; and the driver of the Oldsmobile, a 35-year-old Northville man.

All were taken to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia and Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills. The Livonia man was airlifted to University of Michigan Hospital, Ann Arbor, in critical condition with unspecified injuries, police said.

The accident was still under investigation Wednesday and police

were unsure whether alcohol was a factor.

There were no injuries in the earlier accident, which Dawley termed "a fender bender" on Schoolcraft Road, west of Haggerty.

"He was driving at a high rate of speed and on the wrong side of the road when the cars collided" in Livonia, Dawley said.

"It looks like the other driver didn't realize it until they were less than 100 feet apart."

Mueller

K.C. Mueller said she's running for Plymouth Township trustee. "Because I feel that I have a positive contribution to make to the community."

In her background as a realtor for 20 years, Mueller said she can determine "how land is used to its best, highest ability," and adds she wants to make sure township government is run properly.

Mueller is past president of both the Plymouth Symphony Society and the Woman's Club of Plymouth, and has served on the ethics committee and professional standards committee of the Western Wayne-Oakland County Association of Realtors.

Mueller said the township "should have a five-, 10-, and 20-year plan."

"We're going to have to make sure we have the ability to generate income in the future. There is the

possibility the services should be left to one authority," she said.

On failed talks between the city and township over merged services, Mueller said both sides "have to get rid of their personal agendas, just stop it."

"Truly, the solution is eliminating the way we charge people right now for fire protection," Mueller said, adding that an elected fire department authority could be a solution.

She also calls for "less government by attorney control."

"I understand preventive acts," Mueller said, but added the present township government seeks the advice of attorneys for too many decisions.

On questions over the Western Townships Utilities Authority,

Mueller said the seeking of some contracts "without seeking bids raised ethical questions."

"I think that's what the race is all about," she said.

Griffith

Incumbent trustee Ron Griffith is seeking a second four-year term on the Plymouth Township board.

The dean of educational services at Schoolcraft College said, "I was raised in a family that was involved in the community, involved with their neighbors contributing to others' needs."

In other background that serves him as a trustee, Griffith cites his work with the Jaycees in Kentucky more than 20 years ago. "We built a lot of bridges between different kinds of people, different kinds of forces."

Griffith has also served at Schoolcraft as dean of community services. "You had to deliver services that were needed by the community. It brings you in contact with all the different elements, it forces you to grapple with all the different elements."

On the issue of whether to seek

shared services with the city, Griffith said, "The township and the city could both have benefitted from that. It was unfortunate we couldn't get an agreement," he said, adding the two sides disagreed on what they should contribute.

"I happen to think the township was right, we have to look after township residents," Griffith said.

"I don't think it's a dead issue, it's going to be revisited. Maybe if the chemistry is right we can come to some agreement," said Griffith, who served on the township's negotiating committee.

On the Western Townships Utilities Authority project, Griffith said, "The citizens will reap benefits in the long term."

By not seeking bids for some professional services, WTUA officials "did the wrong thing in the haste of trying to do the right thing," Griffith said.

"They had a very big job. They did the best they could with the time constraints," he said, adding an auditor determined the law was not broken in awarding some contracts without seeking bids.

Munfakh

Abe Munfakh is seeking re-election to his third term on the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees.

A vice president with an Ann Arbor engineering firm, Munfakh said, "I would like to see us continue the course established by the present board to provide service to the community, keeping the lid on taxes, thus keeping the lowest tax rates in western Wayne County."

Munfakh said that in the next four years, the board should work to continue to improve roads and streets, create transportation and other opportunities for seniors, and to place more emphasis on recreation for our youth and families.

He has served on the township planning commission, as president of the Trailwood Homeowners Association, and with other community groups.

While Munfakh has been an interested trustee at meetings, asking questions and raising concerns about measures that could raise taxes, some residents have questioned his role in the controversy over the Western Townships Utilities Authority project.

Munfakh's firm was awarded a contract to perform engineering services for the project by WTUA, a contract that was not bid.

Munfakh said "I had no hand or influence whatever" in his firm get-

ting the contract. Also, Munfakh said he abstained on votes related to the project once his firm began working for WTUA.

Arnold

Kay Arnold, the chamber of commerce 1992 "Volunteer of the Year" stresses participation in the community.

"I believe that community involvement should be the responsibility of most citizens at different levels," said Arnold, 53, a candidate for Plymouth Township trustee.

"People complain and they don't do anything I like the quality of life in the township," Arnold said, adding trustees should better address senior citizen issues.

Arnold is business manager for Colonial Collision and sits on the boards of the Community Federal Credit Union and the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce.

"When you're sitting on the board of the credit union you have a fiduciary responsibility to members to see their money is spent wisely," Arnold said.

"My financial background is very strong as is my community involvement," she said, adding trustees should better address issues of senior citizen services and housing, among other issues.

The Western Townships Utilities Authority project "is a very good project. It will give us more say in our rates. We can negotiate with Ypsilanti," Arnold said, unlike Detroit where rates are dictated. "It will insure cleaner water going into the Great Lakes."

The WTUA board has been criticized for not always seeking bids for services. Arnold said bids should be sought. "It's black and white and

Curmi

Charles Curmi stresses a no-nonsense approach to decision making and integrity in his campaign for Plymouth Township trustee.

"I have the ability to balance a lot of different interests and ideas to come up with a decision," said Curmi, 37, an automotive development supervisor with Exxon Chemical Co.

"I've seen every aspect of the business. The auto business is extremely complex, knowing how to make decisions. The consequences of making the wrong one are immediately obvious."

He stresses an ability to use analytical skills and an open mind to make decisions.

"It didn't work 25 years ago, it

might work today," he said. "Let's take a look at it, review it and make a decision."

"I think the township would benefit from that sort of experience. Sometimes that makes the decision a little slower, but it's a quality decision," Curmi said.

Besides that, the lifelong township resident said serving in township elected office "is something I've always wanted to do."

On questions over the Western Townships Utilities Authority, he said those running the project "could have done a much better job educating citizens about what they were going to do."

Carol Davis has served on several community boards and says, "I can work with other people to solve problems."

Plymouth Township trustee candidate Davis also stresses a record of service to the community.

She has served five years as chairwoman of the Plymouth District Library Board and continues to serve as a board trustee, and once served five years on the Plymouth Canton Community School Board.

As a resident of the township for the past 19 years, "I have watched the growth and change that has taken place," Davis said. "I want to be part of the decision making process."

My integrity together with my

willingness to consider all aspects of an issue will make me a constructive member of the township board.

Asked why she's running, Davis said, "I grew up in a house where it was considered part of your civic responsibility to be active in the community."

"I don't have any particular axe to grind," Davis said, adding she could be effective in bringing together various factions of the community to solve problems.

On the subject of the Western Townships Utilities Authority, Davis said, "I think I would have

Trustee candidate Joe Van Esley says most people are dissatisfied with incumbent politicians.

"I'm running because I think people are upset with the way things have been going all the way up and down the ladder," said Van Esley, 35, who owns a real estate business. "Trustee is something I can handle."

"I think local government has let our people down here," he continued. "I'm not saying this is a terrible place, but there's room for improvement."

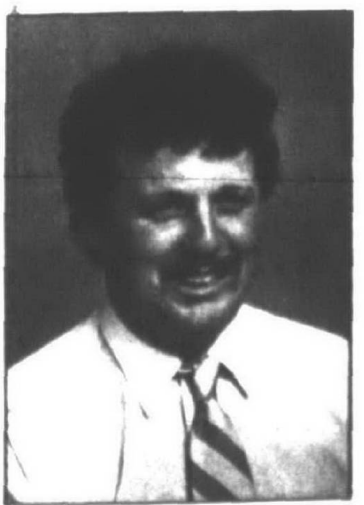
"A few of these people on the board I think don't have independent minds."

"I don't like going over to township hall and being told, 'Go away and come back next week. People don't want business as usual any more.'"

Van Esley said the township could do more to provide recreation opportunities. "I think they leave a lot of it up to the county at Hines Park. Do we have any basketball leagues?" he said, adding he'd like to get involved on a recreation committee.

"Maybe we need another park or two," he said, on the township's west side.

The seeking of some contracts without bids was wrong, Curmi said. "In business, I would have been severely reprimanded or lost my job."

"When you're using public money, you need it to be above board, and it should also appear to be above board, so the people have confidence you're doing the right thing."

Curmi said he couldn't evaluate the potential benefit of the project. "An analysis has not been shared with me, the long-term operating costs — I have not seen that." The project is positive for the environment in the long term, he said.

On shared services talks between the city and township — those talks have broken off —

Curmi said "Everybody has a different set of numbers. I want to revisit it."

He suggested that citizens be involved in negotiations. In each side evaluating what its contribution should be to a merged fire department — the sticking point in the talks — Curmi said each should ask the other "What have you assumed in your number?"

"We've got to develop a win-win situation for everybody involved."

Curmi said trustees should stick with the township's master zoning plan, and seek to control taxes and spending. "Money can be saved. I would work to do that."

"One of the major issues is restoring credibility and confidence," he said.

While Van Esley has not served before on an elected board, he said that as part of his job, "I have been to more (area) board meetings than I can count. I can notice when they're running right and when they're not running right."

On the issue of the city and township talking over shared services, Van Esley said that if elected, "you have to represent the township first. It's the city that is in more financial difficulty than the township."

"An equitable formula hasn't been found yet. It isn't simple, you're dealing with unions, peo-

ple's jobs. It would be kind of like negotiating a contract to sell real estate; you need an intermediary."

"I'm good at bringing people together. It's (a settlement) got to be a win-win situation for everybody."

On questions raised over Western Townships Utilities Authority contracts, he said, "In the long run it should be a good project. Why be held captive to the city of Detroit?"

The issuing of some WTUA contracts with-

out seeking bids "just gives you a sour taste in your mouth. People were representing themselves and not representing the people," Van Esley said.

On future development, Van Esley said he wouldn't fool with the current master zoning plan. "I really would like to see the industrial base along M-14 expanded," he said.

"If I get elected to the board, I plan on listening to what people say."

Van Esley is married, with three children.

made the same decision to get out of Wayne County (water and sewer).

Some have criticized WTUA for not letting bids for professional services early on. "On the library board it has been our policy to get three bids. These are the things that logically occur especially when you are dealing with taxpayers' money," she said.

On merging fire department or other services with the city — talks have broken off between the two sides — Davis said library cooperative purchasing "is more cost effective. And in a time when taxpayers are carrying more of a burden we need to find more cost effectiveness."

While shared services talks broke off over how much each side should contribute to a joint fire department, Davis said, "You have to find some kind of a common denominator." She said personality clashes between the two sides could have played a factor.

"There maybe needs to be different people doing the negotiating," she said.

Davis said she's for keeping with the township's current development plan, favors coordinating election precincts so folks vote in the same place in school and general elections, and would like to see a traffic light or lower speed limit at Ann Arbor Road and Beck, saying the intersection is dangerous.

Davis, 48, is married with two sons.

Mueller said she'd like to review WTUA contracts, but said the project is good in theory.

"Detroit is going to have to spend a bundle of money to get the same type of system," she said.

Mueller suggested that if both the city and township "end ego wars," both sides could get together on planning to benefit greater

Plymouth. "Downtown Plymouth could be expanded, I do see that as a future thing," she said.

Mueller said that "without some kind of reworking of the city," some commercial development could be possible in the west side of the township.

Mueller, 47, is married and has one daughter.

"They probably got as good a price as they would have got on the open market," Griffith said.

Griffith takes credit for helping the township maintain planned development and avoiding spot zoning, saying the township "will continue to be a very fine community to live in."

"I'm concerned about the township's financial situation down the road, we've been leveling off the growth, we're going to be facing ever-tightening budget situations," he said.

"I see Plymouth and Plymouth Township doing more cooperative things down the road," Griffith said. "I envision one community."



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Area Democrats helping to build party's platform

NEW YORK — Democrats need ed 17 days in 1860 and nine in 1920 to pick a presidential candidate. This year they knew weeks ago that Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton had the nomination sewed up. Why five days of activities?

"A convention touches only the superficial role of the delegates," said Birmingham attorney Don Tucker, attending his sixth conclave.

"The delegate selection process is part of the realignment of power every four years. That's the principal reason people are here," said Tucker, a Paul Tsongas supporter.

For the McKnights of Westland, New York is a family vacation.

Dick McKnight, a Livonia school board member and 15th District Clinton delegate, watched a non-partisan news conference by the Childrens Defense Fund in the media center Ramada Hotel.

"Hillary Clinton is chair of it. It's interested in Head Start, prenatal care, children born with drug addiction, education, children who go to bed hungry," he said.

"Whoever you send to the Republican convention will see the same

event," added wife Gail McKnight, a district judge in Westland. "It's like a Sunday church service with rabbis, ministers, men women, black, white, all denominations."

Dick: "Campaign magazine has a number of seminars, free — direct mail, raising money. "The magazine bought a full-page ad in the party's convention paper listing seminars on opposition research, "lightning attacks to exploit weakness," combating the press, women candidates, high-donor fund-raising, polling and best campaign commercials.

Visiting was son Edward (Ted), an Army private first class stationed at Fort Steuart, Ga. "We haven't seen him in three or four months," said Gail.

By the numbers

Michigan has 159 delegates (73 for Clinton, 38 for Jerry Brown, 20 for Paul Tsongas and 28 unpledged) and 22 alternates (17 Clinton, three Brown, two Tsongas).

"In 1980, they (Coleman Young's forces) froze us out," recalled Wayne County Executive Ed McNamara. "This year we were

with Clinton from the beginning. We were very magnanimous and gave them some delegates."

McNamara's tale underscored how delegates were selected: by the camps of the candidates, based on voter turnout in the March 17 primary.

"We've got to leave here like the Republicans do — unified. They pull together all their divergent groups," said McNamara who as mayor of Livonia for a quarter-century had plenty of time to watch the Grand Old Party ascend.

"I think we've got the guy (Clinton) who can do it," McNamara said.

Because of his high office holder position, McNamara and wife Lucille will be attending several VIP functions such as a cocktail reception for national chairman Ron Brown and a breakfast hosted by Clinton confidante Jim Blanchard, Michigan's former governor.

Emily's network

"I'm going from event to event to event... in a word networking," said state Sen. Lana Pollack, D-Ann Arbor.

"The business of the convention is essentially completed. There are no battles to be fought. It's not a contentious environment," said the third-term lawmaker who is an add-on delegate for Massachusetts Sen. Paul Tsongas.

Unlike Jerry Brown, another rival of Bill Clinton for the presidential nomination, Tsongas quietly folded his effort, endorsed relatively minor

changes in the party platform.

Pollack planned to attend an "Emily's List" reception Tuesday, a closed gathering in the New York Hilton Grand Ballroom. The purpose is to raise \$750,000 for women Democrats running for the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives this year. (Emily means Early Money Is Like Yeast — it raises the dough.)

Pollack herself benefitted from the Emily fund in her 1988 bid against Republican U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell of Plymouth.

"I'll spend the week meeting people, discussing how we win the November election," Pollack said, admitting Michigan has few interesting races from the point of view of women Democrats.

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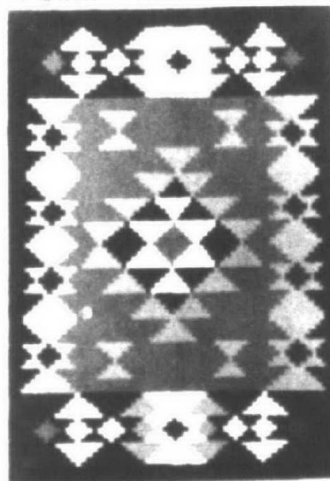
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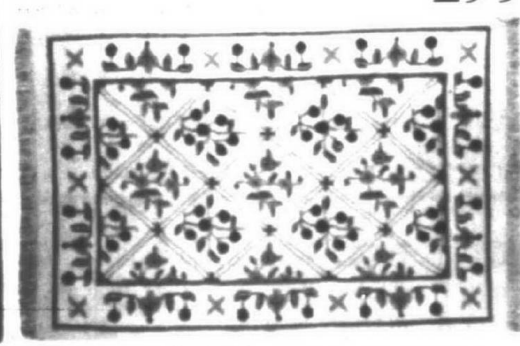
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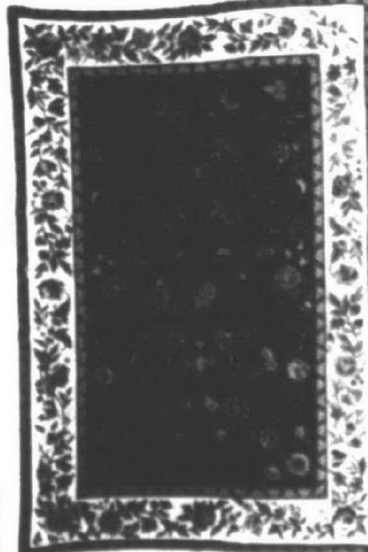

"If I had to do it again I would have to do it exactly as I did it before," he said. "I have not gained anything from WTUA," he said.

"When the project was approved unanimously by 21 elected officials on three township boards, that tells you it is good."

"I think my experience on the board will be very valuable to the new board," Munfakh said, adding he would like to see work on recreation and senior projects through to completion.

He served on the shared services committee with the city, saying shared services "could save the communities money."

He said the township's decision to hire three fire fighters to

staff the new station shouldn't keep the city and township from getting back together to discuss joint fire services. "I think there's an area of middle ground we can reach. An area of trust needs to be reached."

The township's development pattern - which keeps high-tech and light industrial development out by M-14 and commercial development along Ann Arbor Road - was put together when Munfakh was on the township planning commission.

"Because of that we have become the nicest developed community in Wayne County," he said, adding that can continue by sticking with the master zoning plan.

you don't have to look over your shoulder."

On whether the city and township should continue talks to merge the two fire departments, Arnold said, "I would look to anything to save the township money and continue the level of service we have."

The township's master land zoning plan "is about 15 years old. It should be reviewed and examined carefully at certain intervals," Arnold said.

"We should guard against using all our green areas," she said, add-

ing, "I'd like to see something (recreation facility) for our young people," before the township is fully developed.

Arnold said a facility would not have to be township-owned.

She suggested having a part of the township where more affordable housing is available for young people who grew up here seeking their first house in Plymouth.

"I think my integrity and honesty will be an asset to the board, my attention to detail."

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Local physician voice for Asian-Americans

NEW YORK -- If unions are half the Michigan delegation to the Democratic National Convention, Stella Evangelista is the smallest bloc. One.

"I'm the only Asian," said the Bloomfield Hills pediatrician who practices in Livonia, attending her first national convocation with husband, Jose, also a pediatrician.

"We are hoping to mobilize the Asian-Pacific group to vote. They are concentrated in the metro Detroit area. There is probably 200,000."

Her support of Bill Clinton for president is tied directly to the support of former Gov. James Blanchard, whom she backed in 1982. "We helped during the Blanchard campaigns and since then have been active in the Democratic Party."

"Blanchard set up the first Asian Advisory Council in Michigan (of which she was a member). The problems we run into are discrimination, Japan bashing - we tend to be the racial scapegoats for the economic ills of the U.S. In Michigan

it's mainly discrimination in employment.

"Asians were considered the 'model minority' in the Reagan Administration. That has hurt rather than helped us."

"In health care, Asians have special problems such as TB and hepatitis."

Born in Cebu, the Philippines, in 1945, Evangelista came with her husband to the United States in 1968, first to Cook County Hospital in Illinois, then to Wayne County and the University of Michigan. Their practice is on Farmington Road in Livonia. They have six children ranging in age from 8 to 24.

Her activities include American Citizens for Justice, which helps Asians with discrimination and immigration problems; the Philippine Medical Association and the Philippine-American Community Council.

"Democrats have always - a long time - advocated civil rights, reform and social legislation. I think that's why a lot of Asians look up to that," she said.

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Her AIDS battle moves local delegates to tears

NEW YORK — "Just a mom" stole the Democratic National Convention's hearts away from Jesse Jackson's oratory.

"Sh-h-h-h!" the Michiganians hissed as Elizabeth Glaser stopped the noisy convention in its tracks with the story of how she acquired AIDS through a blood transfusion in 1981, passed it onto a daughter who died and then to a son, and faces death itself.

If Rev. Jackson brought the convention to its feet in prime TV time, Glaser silenced it and sent out her message: "Not just for people who have HIV, but for many, many people — poor people, gay people, people of color, children. A strange spokesperson for such a group — a

well-to-do white woman," she said of herself.

"I was crying," said Eileen DeHart, Westland resident and Clinton delegate. "To lose your children is the most traumatic thing. The thought of losing them tears you apart."

"A moving moment. It strikes you like a thunderbolt. Unfortunately, she was not on in prime time," said U.S. Rep. Sander Levin of Southfield. "For years George Bush wouldn't mention the word AIDS. I was on a subcommittee of Government Operations in 1983 when the undersecretary of Health said there was adequate money for AIDS research and later acknowledged he fibbed through his teeth. As a result, the nation lost valuable time."

"People identify with someone who says 'I'm experiencing this,'" said Keith Geiger, president of the National Education Association. Geiger visited his native state's delegation Wednesday morning.

"The speeches by Mrs. Glaser and Jesse Jackson," moved Walter O. Briggs IV, Democratic hopeful in the 11th congressional District. "She told about the concerns and trial she's been through, relating them to an average family. It makes you realize this is not just a disease

of the underprivileged and gays.

"I'm staying with my parents in Connecticut during the convention. My mother wanted to know about that (speech). My wife, too," said Briggs.

"Only the most heartless would fail to be taken by emotion," said Don Tucker, Birmingham attorney, Tsongas delegate and Oakland County chair. "A middle-class family woman contracted AIDS through a transfusion . . . The link should

cause us to recognize this is truly a plague."

"Too bad it wasn't on prime time. It (Glaser's speech) showed the lack of compassion in this government," said Gail Nolin, Clinton delegate from Waterford and MEA official.

"Enormously moving," said Mary Ryan Taras, Birmingham teacher, Clinton delegate and an MEA leader. "As a mother — as a parent — the loss of a child has to be the worst experience."

Married to Paul Michael Glaser, a director and former Starsky on the "Starsky and Hutch" television series, Mrs. Glaser, 44, blistered the Reagan and Bush administration for indifference to Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome, which attacks the body's immune system and has been spread through body

fluids by blood transfusions, use of shared intravenous needles and sexual activity.

"Exactly four years ago my daughter died of AIDS. She did not survive the Reagan administration. I am here because my son and I may not survive four more years of leaders who say they care but do nothing," she said.

"Now I realize that they don't hear because they don't want to listen . . ."

"Do you know how much my AIDS care costs? Over \$40,000 a year. Someone without insurance can't afford this . . ."

"This is not the America I was raised to be proud of — where rich people get care and drugs that poor people can't. We need health care for all."

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Blanchard: Clinton's old friend is also Gore's pal

NEW YORK — Everyone knows former Gov. James Blanchard is tight with Democratic presidential nominee Bill Clinton.

Less known is that he's also tight with running mate Albert Gore Jr.

"He supported the Chrysler package," said Blanchard, who was elected to the U.S. House in 1974 with Gore following in '76.

"(Then-Rep. Dan) Quayle tried to kill it and Bush was opposed," Blanchard said. The federal underwriting of Chrysler Corp.'s loans helped save the No.3 automaker in 1979 and propelled Blanchard into the governor's office in 1982.

"I served on the Science and Technology Committee with Gore. He and I were part of the congressional committee on the house of the future."

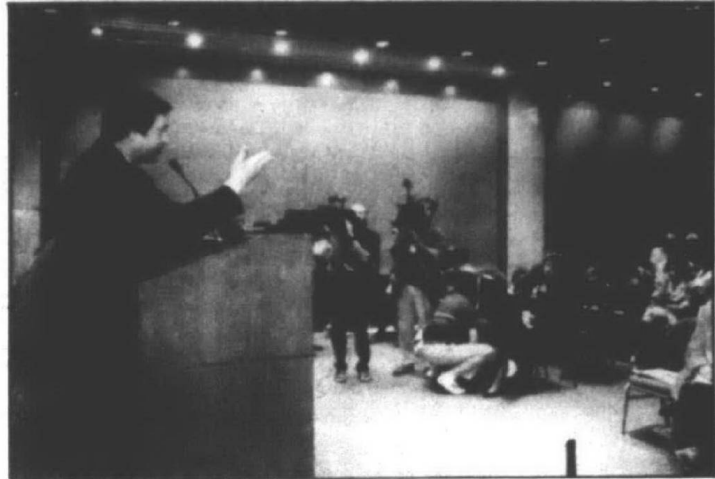
"The last time he was in Oakland County I introduced him at a Phil Hart dinner and said one day he will be president of the United States. He's close," Blanchard said.

Blanchard turns 50 on Aug. 8 and looks thinner than in his 30s. He and wife Janet had a hectic schedule of speeches and events. Although listed as chair of the Michigan Clinton caucus, Blanchard is staying in Clinton's hotel. A ground-floor Clinton supporter, Blanchard may be due for a presidential appointment if Clinton wins the White House.

"I'm a little upset that both (Clinton and Gore) are younger than I am," Blanchard told Michigan delegates at their Mouday morning caucus. Clinton is 43, Gore 44.

The irreverent Blanchard humor was still there: "Clinton was so brilliant a student at Georgetown University that all the Jesuits thought he was Catholic and not Baptist."

Clinton and Blanchard freely borrowed each other's ideas on education and job training as governors.

Veep choice called 'workhorse'

NEW YORK — "In Congress there are workhorses and show horses. He has been mostly a workhorse" said U.S. Rep. Bill Ford of vice presidential nominee Albert Gore Jr.

Gore moved from the House to the Senate in 1984, but Ford sees him often anyway.

"On the Post Office and Civil Service Committee, I've had to work with the Senate because the Senate would put military stuff in bills in my jurisdiction. I wound up as a conferee (member of the joint House-Senate conference committee)," Ford said.

The 28-year congressional veteran who now calls Ypsilanti home said "Gore helped" resolve those bills. Gore is considered an expert on the armed services.

"In the real world, we had to decide whether scientists would be hired at scientists' wages or pay 'em like civil service. We hired the scientists," Ford said.

"I did not, unfortunately play basketball with him in the House, but he was an avid basketball player," Ford added.

"Albert is one of our graduates," said U.S. Rep. John Dingell of Trenton. A 35-year

member of Congress, Dingell heads the Energy and Commerce Committee, one of the most powerful in Washington. Gore served on it during his House tenure.

"Capable. Smart. Strong on environment and consumer issues. A strong liberal. Very talented," Dingell said of Gore.

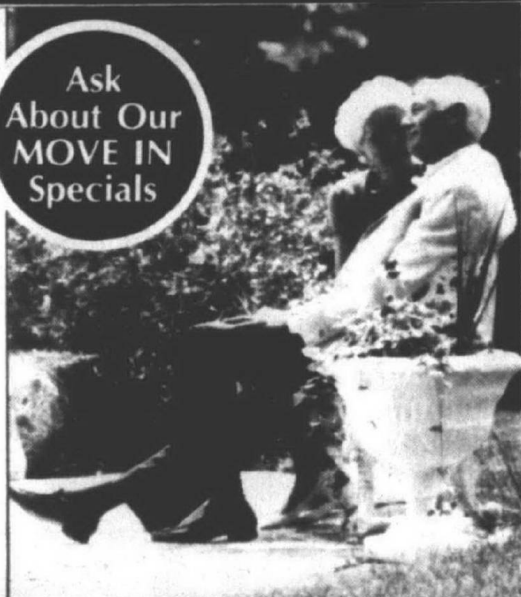
Sens. Tim Wirth of Colorado and Phil Gramm of Texas also were on Dingell's panel before moving up. "They all brag about the fact that the (House) Commerce Committee was a great education," Dingell said. "Few in the Senate would stand up to them."

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Mideast peace

Both sides say U.S. should do more

NEW YORK -- Both Jewish and Arab American Democrats say Republican President George Bush has lost ground with their groups in the Middle East peace process.

"Bush has done a lot for the peace process, but we are no longer the respected country," said Terry Ahwal, Livonia resident and leader in the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination League.

Though not a delegate, Ahwal was placed on the convention credentials committee and sees her group gaining respect in the Democratic Party.

"Arabs were always left out. Things are tremendously improv-

ing. For the first time in the history of the convention, we have two delegates from Michigan, four in the U.S. on the credentials committee and one on the platform committee," she said.

"I'm not happy with how they addressed the Arab-Israeli conflict. They're recognizing that Palestinians have human rights because they're human beings. That's a little positive change.

"But we differ on Jerusalem. They (Democratic platform) are taking Jerusalem as the capital of Israel. We say it should be an international city. No one should have exclusive rights to the holy city," Ahwal said.

U.S. Rep. Sander Levin and state Rep. Maxine Berman, both of Southfield, say Bush grievously offended American Jews with press conference remarks about the Israeli lobby.

"He very much offended the Jewish community when he criticized them for lobbying for loan guarantees (for settlements of immigrants)," Levin said.

"All they were doing was exercising an American right. Obviously, the Bush administration will attempt some kind of smoothing over of the relationship -- some kind of loan guarantees. But it will be difficult for Bush to repair the damage," Berman, who attended an Ameri-

can Israeli PAC meeting, said the mood was calm but echoed Levin's remark that Bush had offended Jews over lobbying. She sees Republicans as losing some of the gains they made with the Jewish vote in past elections.

The mood in the Michigan delegation is far smoother compared to 1988 when the Palestinian intifada (uprising) was starting in Israel. Michigan's Jesse Jackson delegates in 1988 kept to themselves outside the caucus room in Atlanta, and there was ill will over Jackson's "Hymietown" remark about New York. In hotel lobbies, one could see an invisible 4-foot wall between Jackson and other delegates.

Brown supporters few among state delegates

NEW YORK - Michigan delegates aren't joining the emotional fray to let Jerry Brown address the Democratic National Convention.

"Talk to your whips and say, 'Please let Jerry Brown speak,'" Southfield attorney Tom Boyd, chair of the 38-member caucus supporting the former California governor, told the Michigan delegation Tuesday morning.

But Boyd acknowledged Michiganders were showing no enthusiasm as other Brown supporters waved signs for the dissident Californian Monday night on the convention floor in Madison Square Garden. Brown got 26 percent in the March 17 primary.

"He (Brown) is kind of a kook," said Wayne County Executive Ed McNamara. "He's had his day in the sun. Others who challenged Clinton and lost came into the fold. Brown relishes the spotlight."

"Brown has 600 delegates to the convention, but there are only about 200 solid supporters. A hel-

lupa lot of them are UAW people who became Brown delegates just to get to the convention. They're hitchhikers. They should have joined Clinton earlier," McNamara said.

As of Tuesday, convention officials were holding to their position that Brown wouldn't speak before ratification of the platform unless he endorsed nominee Bill Clinton, the way Sens. Bob Kerry, Tom Harkin and ex-Sen. Paul Tsongas had.

Shrugged U.S. Rep. Sander Levin of Southfield: "Jerry Brown, in terms of the November elections, is really not a major factor."

State party chair Gary Corbin said most delegates' "eyes are on the prize" rather than Brown. He said convention leaders gave him no instructions to hold down demonstrations for Brown. A party newspaper article was headlined: "Brown Hotline in New York: 1-800-NUISANCE."

Convention bigwig touts his state ties

"We (NEA) eliminated Bush real early because of his record. Zero. Jerry Brown didn't respond to our questionnaire."

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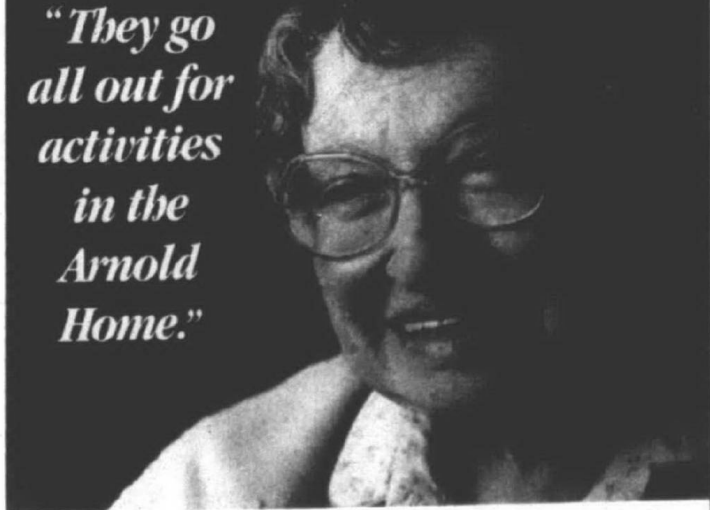
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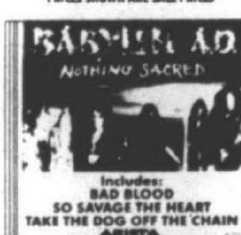


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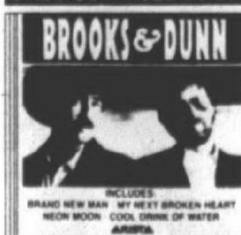
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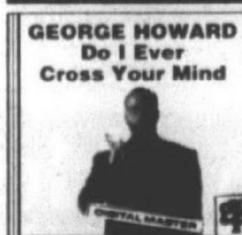
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Young detectives learn how to solve crimes

One kid wanted to visit the morgue. Another hoped to learn how to bug a room.

Young super sleuths in the making are learning to solve imaginary crimes in a two-week enrichment class offered by Schoolcraft College this summer.

"I'm trying to gear everything to keep the majority interested and entertained," said Ed Davis, a retired Michigan State trooper and a private detective who is teaching the course. His daughter, Kristen Davis, a criminology student at Grand Valley State College, is as-

sisting in the teaching of 28 grade school students interested in crime solving.

Davis has taught the class to adult students at Schoolcraft and Washtenaw Community colleges, but this is his first stint with pint-sized detectives.

"The class is supposed to be limited to fifth, sixth and seventh graders, but we have some second graders and others taking driver's education — so it's quite an age gap," Davis said.

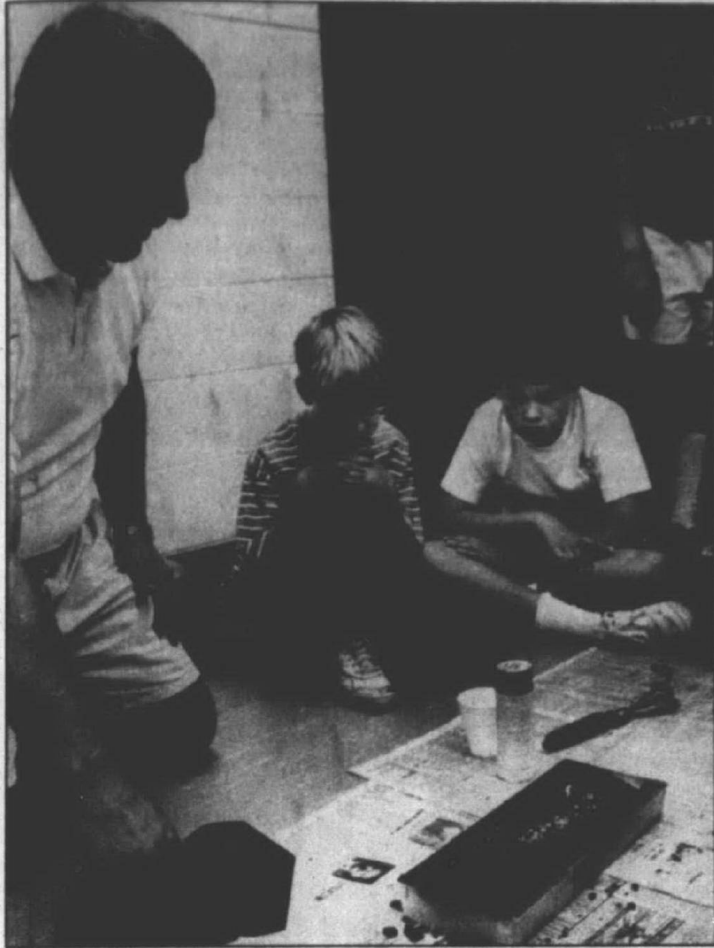
During the first week, the kids dealt with a simulated crime site —

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Room for everyone?

Gays say delegates ignore them

NEW YORK — Two self-styled "transplanted queer Michiganders" had little success approaching the Michigan delegation to the Democratic National Convention for changes back home.

"There are no openly gay Democratic delegates from Michigan," said Bill Dobbs, who lived in Birmingham in the '70s and is a law graduate from the University of Michigan.

"Queers are trash in this country," Dobbs said in literature he distributed to Michigan delegates. "Just as Eric (a friend from Birmingham who died in New York City of AIDS) couldn't be frank about his life with his own family, America . . . can't seem to talk

about or deal with AIDS or queers. How many more have to die?"

Dobbs and Jon Nalley, a former Grand Haven and East Lansing resident, tried to hop a bus ride with Michigan delegates from the UN Plaza Hotel to a Sunday night reception at the American Museum of the Moving Image. Lacking delegate or press credentials, they were asked to leave.

"Our being thrown off the bus is a metaphor for how Michigan treats gays," Dobbs said.

They managed to beat the bus to the museum and were passing out literature when five New York police officers stopped them. After five minutes conversation, the police backed away, and the pair went off to work.

"A classic gambit by the NYPD," Dobbs said later. "I have a Corrections pass, and I'm a lawyer." The reception they got from Michigan delegates varied from warm to hostile.

In contrast to their native state, Dobbs said, Texas has 11 gay delegates, California "a couple dozen" New York has some. In his view, political meetings shouldn't be conducted without representation from women, gays and ethnic groups. "They (gays) were frozen out," he said after contacting a Michigan gay lesbian group.

Nalley listed 12 friends from Michigan State University who died of AIDS.

He is 32. And his literature listed "A Queer Dozen" things Michigan Democrats should do back

home, including:

- A state law prohibiting non-hiring of gays, as Cracker Barrel announced it would do.

- Repeal of Michigan's sodomy law which police in Adrian used in a park sting operation.

- University board rules at U-M, MSU and Wayne State prohibiting anti-gay discrimination.

- Repeal of Public Act 490 under which Jeffrey Hanlon was extradited from New York State to Michigan for infecting people with HIV positive virus. Dobb worked on Hanlon's defense.

- Restore and fund the Michigan Council for the Arts, who boldly stood up for free expression.

- "Dump (Gov. John) Engler."

"I'm still trying to decide what I want to be when I grow up," Shellhaas admits proudly as she sits in a room that she built in the family 'homestead' in Plymouth.

When Shellhaas began carving 18 years ago it wasn't as a hobby. The very detailed miniature furniture she created was highly regarded by collectors, but they were not pieces she would select for herself from a gallery.

"They weren't exactly the kind of pieces you would have your 3-year-old play with. As a matter of fact I couldn't afford to even buy some of my pieces," she said.

She studied the designs of three centuries of furniture and yet never copied the pictures she saw in the books.

"I studied the designs, but never felt it was mine if I copied it from a picture," Shellhaas said.

For the first 15 years of her career she worked 80-hour weeks carving pieces for galleries and shops across the country. She took care to make sure her creations were sold by only one dealer per state so that they would not become commonplace. In those first years of her career she carved 4,600 pieces.

She also built two dollhouses drawing on her love of architecture and recreated Mark Twain's legendary bed for a mu-

seum in Connecticut.

"I was trying to gracefully get out of the business, but people kept tracking me down, so I decided to go back to school," she said.

Shellhaas attended Schoolcraft and then went on to Eastern Michigan University where she studied under sculptor John Pappas.

"He got me to make things bigger and bigger and made it more interesting to

me," she said.

Now, Shellhaas has happily expanded her horizons. She still teaches a class in miniature furniture carving for the Miniature Makers' Workshop in Royal Oak and she taught for awhile at Greenfield Village, but she finds greater rewards in teaching her small class of carvers in her home and exploring her

imagination and the blocks of wood for more eclectic figures.

"I love carving and I love teaching. I'm just not sure where to go from there," she said.

Shellhaas is not selling any of her wares these days. She is finding great serenity, however, in creating a sort of medieval carousel. The figures are either charmingly gruesome or graceful and elegant. The carousel itself lives only in Shellhaas' mind.

"I love working on them. I thrive on intense detail and love all the variations," Shellhaas said with great excitement as she runs her fingers down the scaled back of a 'beautiful' dragon. "It's difficult to go back to doing the furniture where you're locked into the high renaissance."

Shellhaas works the figures out of blocks of basswood. She makes a model on paper and then works on a prototype from wood. She keeps all of the prototypes for herself.

"They're not usually the best pieces, but they are the first ones. It's where it starts."

Once the figure has emerged, Shellhaas goes at it with paint and brush. Many sculptors, she said, are afraid of color, but she thrives on it.

Each piece can take from 50 to 500 hours and Shellhaas takes care to document every hour spent.

She has carved a few full-size

carousel horses, one of which will someday be sold. The other horse, which never made it past the head piece, will remain on display in her home.

"This one I will just never sell. I really have strong feelings toward it," Shellhaas said of the horse's head on display in her family room.

The artist, however, has learned that she cannot keep everything she makes.

"I am attached to the piece as I am working on it. It's an extension of while you're working on it, but you have to let it go."

While Shellhaas' current work is unusual, she maintains some sense of reality by studying the way muscles move and hair flows. She studies animal books to select body parts for the creatures she sees in her mind before they take shape in the wood.

"There are some absolutes that you cannot change," she explains. "Muscles move a certain way on the skeleton. That doesn't change."

Shellhaas has made efforts to pass her art onto her children. Her son has no interest at all, she said, and while her daughter has a real flair for it, she does not share her love for the wood.

"Most people who try it love it," Shellhaas said. "I've only had one student who just really hated it."

While the local sculptor is now doing something she loves, she is

not ready to stop exploring new options for her skills. After building a new deck this summer, she has become interested in landscape architecture and may take some classes in that area. She would also like to

Ribcrackers take to skies over fest

Air traffic was high above North Farmington High School last weekend as the Ribcrackers, a radio control plane group, took over the sky in celebration of the Farmington Founders Festival.

Members of the group are frequently kidded about their club name and asked whether the club is made up of retired chiropractors.

Not so, say members.

A club member's 9-year old daughter coined the group's name during the 1960s after watching and taking note of the amount of ribs in the plane's airfoil that were broken as a result of flying.

The Ribcrackers were originally organized as a non-profit model airplane club under the auspices of the Livonia Department of Parks and Recreation. The group numbers 130 and emphasizes safe sports flying.

Watching a show is addicting. "I came and watched a show," said Dan Wamboldt, the club's current club president and West Bloomfield resident, as he explained how he got started.

Ribcrackers members host several events throughout the year including pylon races, limbo contests, balloon bursts and fun flying.

Hilda, the witch, a plane dressed up as a witch atop a broom, is a hit at every air show, Wamboldt said. "Barry Killick, a club member, built the witch seven or eight years ago," Wamboldt said.

Hilda usually sustains some damage after flight but Saturday she completely lost her head when she collided with another plane.

"When she gets near the ground, her legs actually drag on the ground like she's walking," said Jac Mosier, club treasurer, who lives in South Lyon.

Dr. Keith Shaw, of Ann Arbor, who Wamboldt termed a "top electric modeler in the world" was on hand to fly his electric planes (electric motor and battery). One achieved a speed of 140 mph.

"Blink and it's in the next county," said the announcer when Shaw's plane buzzed by.

Shaw helped John Buck, 14, of Redford, a first-time flyer, learn to

fly a plane via a buddy box training system, which consists of a cord and two transmitters so that the expert can step in whenever there is an error or mistake.

Don Krzysik's Fisher Flying Products 303, an ultralite plane, was displayed but not flown at the airshow, sponsored by the Farmington Area Jaycees. "I plan to take the plane to Fowlerville for its maiden flight this summer," said Krzysik, a Wixom resident.

It took Krzysik six years to finish building the plane, which was constructed in his second floor apartment. "The 28 foot wing span took part of the living room and part of the dining room," Krzysik said.

Model aircraft kits suitable for beginners are available in hobby shops starting at about \$350 and will take about 50-60 hours or "a month of spare time" to build, according to club information.

The club also owns an ICOM scanner to check for potential radio interference at flying sites and a library of aircraft videotapes.

Club officers say that learning to fly varies with the student's proficiency — some require several years, others take one flying season. The club has two flying sites: Russell Field, just south of 10 Mile, between Taft and Novi roads, in Novi, and Ray Field, on Grand River, one mile east of New Hudson.

Annual club dues are \$30 with a one-time initiation fee of \$10. Junior members (younger than 18) may join the club at no cost. A youth group is currently being formed. Members are also urged to join the Academy of Model Aeronautics, which provides insurance coverage. An AMA membership is required for flying radio control aircraft at club fields.

The club meets the first and third Mondays during the school year at Holmes Middle school in Livonia. During the summer, business meetings are held at the Livonia Senior Center with the second meeting of the month held at Ray Field, on Grand River, one mile east of New Hudson.

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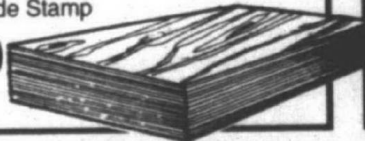

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Trustee race

These 4 are best for township

A controversial sewer project and back-room politics have helped to bring seven Republicans to the Aug. 4 primary for trustee in Plymouth Township.

There are no Democrats in the race, and barring any write-in campaigns in November, the primary will settle the matter.

The candidates are: K.C. Mueller, Abe Munkfakh, Kay Arnold, Charles Curmi, Carol Davis, Ron Griffith and Joseph VanEsley.

We recommend Mueller, Griffith, VanEsley and Curmi.

To us those candidates will best serve Plymouth Township to clean up its tarnished image.

That image problem is more perception than substance. Plymouth Township is an attractive and generally well-run community. There are no major tasks, other than declining revenues, to face.

The community has used its master plan well and has developed a gem of a light industrial park, Metro West.

Yes, there have been mistakes. The charges of nepotism will always surround the Western Township Utility Authority sewer project, even though it is a good project.

And there was Mettetal Airport. It was former Supervisor Maurice Breen's dream to buy it with federal money and add it to the recreational facilities of the area. It was a good idea, but wasn't carried out properly.

Our endorsements were based on the idea that a new image is needed, while the direction

should remain the same.

Here are the candidates we believe are best:

- Mueller is a longtime Plymouth Township resident and real estate saleswoman who has been active in the schools. But this time she is turning her guns on the township. It's a good thing. Mueller has a vision of Plymouth as one community, not a city and a township, and she sees the two communities working together and maybe eventually merging. It's a vision that should be brought to the board. Mueller has a probing mind and will ask questions of those in power. She also has a pet project. Fire and police consolidation using an authority system. We wish her luck.

- Griffith is an incumbent we hope stays in office in this anti-incumbent year. He is a veteran board member who knows where the township has been and where it should go. An educator at Schoolcraft College, he has a good understanding of township finances. He is an asset to the board.

- Curmi has vigor, intelligence and youth on his side, but no experience. But we're willing to bet he's a fast learner.

- VanEsley is a real estate man and developer who could bring that perspective to the board. He says he has no projects going in Plymouth Township and will not become involved in any. He'll be an asset when the township looks at land development.

It's important that citizens vote on Aug. 4. It's an act that empowers us all.

Stadium sale good for suburbs too

The serious competition between Mike Ilitch and Edsel Ford II for the Detroit

Tigers means suburban Detroiters can breathe a collective sigh of relief. The latest reports have hockey/pizza magnate Ilitch edging out Ford as the leading contender to take the Tigers off cash-short Tom Monaghan's hands.

The pending sale — which still needs approval of other American League team owners — means no stadium will likely be plunked down in western Wayne or northern Oakland County.

Both men, but particularly Ilitch, are business visionaries who take a long-term, regional approach to major decisions. That's one reason Ilitch kept the Red Wings on the Detroit River front instead of skating off to Pontiac. The city's revived theater district and moving Little Caesar's corporate headquarters from Farmington Hills to the Fox Theatre building also demonstrate Ilitch's gutsy style.

That kind of civic commitment indicates a solid effort will be made to keep the Tigers where they belong — in Detroit.

The sale will hopefully kick-start stalled negotiations with Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara over the site and financing for a new stadium, preferably downtown.

It would be even better, of course, if the Tigers' new playing field was built without public financing. Ilitch of Bloomfield Hills and Ford of Grosse Pointe, like Monaghan, are wealthy enough to sink their own money into the project, or at the very least obtain credit or

attract private investors.

We are not naive. A downtown location, while vibrant and easily accessible, won't be the cure-all for Detroit's massive socioeconomic problems.

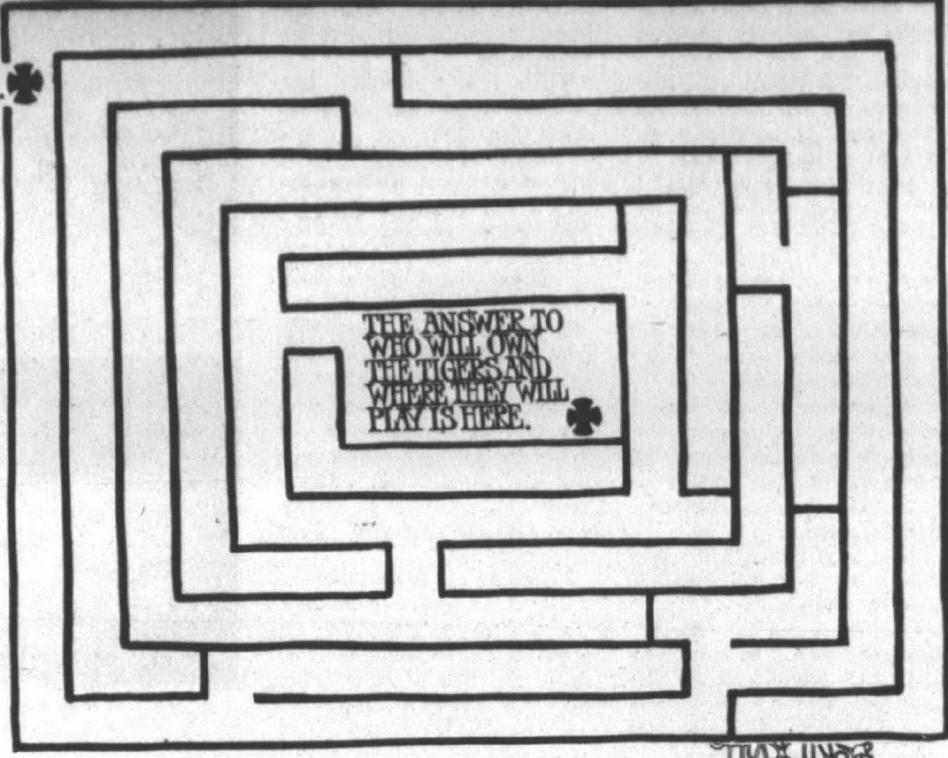
But that solution would be far better for baseball fans and suburban residents alike than building a \$200-million diamond fortress in Plymouth Township, Auburn Hills or some other remote location identified in surveys as "the center of the team's customer base for the 21st century."

A suburban stadium would undoubtedly provide Tigers patrons with a safe environment and ensure the team's profitability.

But it would also contribute heavily to urban sprawl and put the Tigers about 20 years behind the times. Lawsuit awards spell tax increase

The state Court of Claims let the other shoe start falling to the floor last month.

Just as I told you last year it would. Ingham Circuit Judge James Giddings, sitting as the Court of Claims, ruled state government is obliged to pay the costs of operating trial courts. These are the circuit, probate and district courts in 82½ counties.

All sorts of figures are bouncing around about the cost. I would put it at \$400 million per year to the state general fund.

What happened is that in 1980 the state began paying for local courts, starting and stopping with Wayne County and Detroit. The state left out suburban Wayne and the other 82 counties.

Now, most people reading Detroit papers and watching Detroit TV have no idea how bitterly outstaters resent that funneling of their taxes down I-96 to 2 Woodward Avenue. So 76 counties and 56 local units hired Grand Rapids attorney Doug Van Essen to sue.

It took three years. The appeals process will take another three years. But Van Essen's clients are sure to prevail, since many Supreme Court justices are committed to full state funding of trial courts.

Let's put the money into perspective. The state budget currently is in the \$7.5 billion ballpark, putting this cost at 5 percent of the total.

Consider what has happened in the last two punk economic years:

- Gov. John Engler settled the Oakland County mental health suit for several hundred million.

- The state has whacked the welfare, commerce, regulatory and other budget segments hundreds of millions more, holding education levels but throwing more burdens on universities and out-of-formula school districts.

- Engler's "cut and cap" property tax plan is on the ballot and getting enthusiastic support from most Republican legislative candidates. If approved, it will cost more than \$1 billion when phased in over five years.

My prediction has been that if any two of a

long list of things happened, Michiganians will face a substantial tax increase. The Oakland suit was first on the list. The court suit is likely to be the second. The money just isn't there, and the economic growth isn't possible.

There was an interesting wrinkle to the Patterson-Anderson tax cut proposal — remember? The one that didn't get on the ballot. Hidden in the fine print was a section saying the state couldn't raise taxes to pay for lawsuit awards. Brooks Patterson and Patrick Anderson clearly recognized what could happen.

Again: In the next one to eight years, we face a substantial increase in state taxes, whether anyone likes it or not.

The forces are in motion. We can't legislate against them any more than we can legislate against an earthquake or a heat wave.

Meanwhile, we can breathe a sigh of relief that the "KIDS" proposal fell flat on getting signatures for the ballot.

Never mind what the letters K-I-D-S stand for because it's a sham. This Ypsilanti-based group wants to reword the Michigan Constitution to make equitable school funding a constitutional right. In short, they are inviting, asking for, begging for a lawsuit to narrow the gap between rich and poor school districts.

And in these suburbs, our kids' school programs would have been reduced.

Vote for change

This community is suffering a bad case of "entrenchment mouth." Many recent news items about past "dealings" have a common thread . . . the people involved. The entrenched team of Maury Breen, appointed successor Gerald Law, brother Robert Law et al . . . Law, Hemming, Essad and Polaczyk (township attorneys), Abe Munfakh (trustee and his engineering firm, major gatherer of pre-construction funds from WTUA), Georgina Goss (former Northville Township supervisor, former WTUA commissioner) have worked well together. This entrenched teamwork has been very profitable. Supervisor candidate Charles McIlhargey co-chaired Mr. Law's fund-raiser in 1991 with Mr. Breen.

If you agree with an appointed supervisor (Law) 4 months into his position submitting a budget giving himself a \$5,250 raise (annual salary, \$64,050), vote entrenched.

If you agree with spending the 1992 legal budget of \$290,000, vote entrenched. This figure is a 71 percent increase over the 1991 budget forecast of \$169,500. They missed that target last year by paying \$239,587. Perhaps you are thrilled to spend \$12.26 per resident for legal services and only \$6.28 per resident for Recreation services. Canton, Plymouth and Northville townships have the same law firm . . . combined cost is \$657,000. Livonia has a comparable population to those three and with a different law firm receiving \$225,000, or \$2.23 per capita.

Voting "entrenched" perhaps means you are not bothered that only the supervisor had said he had seen a Profit and Loss statement on the proposed purchase of Mettetal Airport, yet it was pushed as a financially viable project. It was financially rewarding, for township attorneys — they picked off \$53,970 of your tax dollars for this effort. Now, this "important project" is willing to be dropped because Trustee Munfakh's sponsored resolution says, in effect, "We are tired of waiting for an answer from the FAA, so we will back out." Nice follow through, eh? Shows real concern for the taxpayer.

Vote "entrenched" if you agree township employees should be allowed to be

fully 100 percent vested in the Defined Contribution pension plan after only 20 months of full-time service. Check out your own plan, but it isn't as generous.

Vote "entrenched" if you have no problem knowing the quarterly payment of \$17.49 listed as a service charge on your water bill is helping defray the legal fees charged on the two WTUA bonds (1989 and 1991) awarded to Law, Hemming, Essad and Polaczyk (with Breen and Gerry Law approving) in the amount of \$910,233. No problem, one supposes, that Mr. Breen took a trip to Washington (your cost — \$632) in March of 1992 to visit the WTUA lobbying group, Cassidy and Associates. At that time Breen had no official decision making capacity with WTUA. But WTUA is "clean" according to the review audit provided in June 1992 by Plante and Moran of the past financial accounting on the project done by Plante and Moran. So they missed a measly \$1,492,183 in issuance costs in their issuance cost comparison which conveniently made the 1991 bond costs look "normal" in the review. They were paid \$28,000 to give the OK to WTUA in awarding professional contracts without soliciting bids for the \$94.5 million project. WTUA was created in 1986 and the residents were given their first newsletter in August 1991.

The June 1992 legal review provided by law firm Dickinson, Wright, Moon, Vann Dusen and Freeman found "no prohibited conflict of interest in regard to the authority's contractual arrangements with attorney John Breen; Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May (Munfakh's firm) or the law firm of Law, Hemming, et al . . ." Dickinson, Wright received \$319,036 for its work on the bonds. This second opinion from the same doctor was certainly a relief and was authorized by the "entrenched."

Vote "entrenched" and support the Township Fund Balance drop from \$2.3 million in 1990 to a 1992 projected \$351,000. A \$1 million bond was approved by the board recently to supplement this decline. Notice how little the taxpayer has known about \$175 million worth of debt they have taken on over the past 3 years.

The upcoming primary and general elections provide the voter and taxpayer

with a choice. Examine the candidates who are fresh and open and without "entrenched-mouth." Vote for positive change and a return to open government. Give the "non-entrenched" candidates all of your consideration.

Mai Kai is step closer to reopening

The vacant Mai Kai theater moved a step closer Tuesday to reopening as a Broadway-style showcase — but opening night may be pushed back a few weeks, according to the theater's new owner.

Stuart Gorelick said late delivery of some theatrical equipment might force an early October premiere for the George Burns Theater for the Performing Arts, rather than the announced Sept. 11 date.

Meanwhile, the planning commission voted 7-0 to forward a recommendation of approval to the Livonia City Council for waiver use of a Class C liquor license. The waiver is necessary because another establishment — Newport Richies — serves alcohol within 1,000 feet of the theater at Plymouth and Farmington roads.

Commissioners also suggested some tight restrictions on the sale of alcoholic beverages to theater patrons. They include:

- Limiting liquor sales to a section of the lobby.

- Opening the bar no earlier than an hour before shows, during intermission and closing no later than an hour after the performance.

- No sales when the attraction is geared toward people younger than 21.

Gorelick quickly agreed to the conditions and appeared eager to please city officials and quell con-

cerns about his business background raised at an earlier planning commission hearing.

"I want to assure you that (the restrictions) are what I will live with," he told commissioners.

The liquor license request was tabled June 16 by the commission after Chuck Fox, a Livonia resident and employee at the Royal Oak Music Theater, alleged previous involvement by Gorelick in an adult movie theater and numerous lawsuits.

Gorelick was sued by the city of Ferndale and Oakland County in the early 1970s when he ran the Studio North theater on Woodward. The separate lawsuits were eventually dropped.

Gorelick, who leased the theater to Paragon Investments (Fox's employers), has a pending lawsuit against the company in Oakland Circuit Court for its renovations to the now-closed Royal Oak theater.

Gorelick said that lawsuit, and others filed against him regarding previous ventures, "are just part of doing business, resolving disputes."

Jack Engebretson, commission chairman, said Tuesday that Gorelick has "submitted substantial documentation that appears to refute" the claims by Fox.

Gorelick said Tuesday he plans about \$4 million in renovations at the 1,400 seat theater.

Some — like resealing the parking lot and adding a canopy to the

entrance — will be done before the 96-year-old entertainer dedicates his namesake theater this fall. Others will be "done in stages, over a period of time," he said.

Gorelick is the sole investor in the theater through a land contract with former owner Louis George. He has Ron Rea of Peterhansra, a Birmingham-based design firm, to oversee the renovation.

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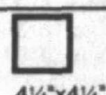

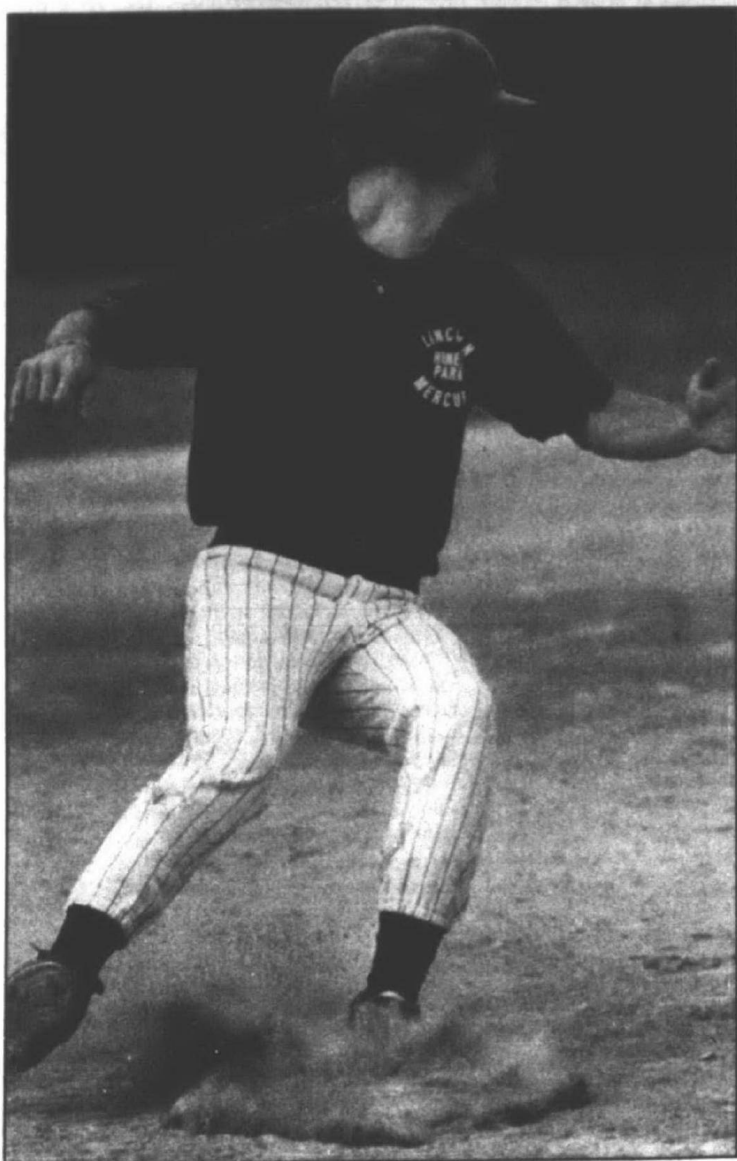

I didn't need to get wet Sunday afternoon to feel all washed-up as a basketball player.

Long before the rain started to fall on last weekend's Gus Macker 3-on-3 basketball tournament in Belding, I knew my role.

Our team was called the "Slow-Motion All-Stars," and while I did a great job moving in slow motion (especially on the rain-soaked asphalt late Sunday), I was no all-star.

Normally I play in the media division where it's easy to look good against guys who write about sports rather than play them.

But last weekend's competition was like none I've ever played against. Our team was in an advanced division which included several players with college experience.

The eventual champion, Carlson ± 3, came from Hope College and was led by 1991 Division III college All-American Eric Elliott, a guard who has signed a professional contract to play in Sweden. (Rick Laven, a 1990 Livonia Stevenson graduate now playing at Grand Rapids Baptist College, also had a team in the our division.)

When a buddy from college, Mike DeVilling, asked last month if I wanted to play in the Belding tournament — the granddaddy of all Mackers — I jumped (probably not too high) at the chance.

DeVilling said his friends, Ken George and Jerry Royce, also were on the team.

"Ken George — wow," I said. "Count me in."

George, a 1986 Farmington Hills Harrison graduate, scored more than 1,100 points while starting four years at guard for Albion College.

Royce was named Most Valuable Player of Troy Athens' 1984 basketball team and he still has an incredibly accurate turnaround jump shot

from 20 feet.

DeVilling, meanwhile, is pretty modest about his game. "I was sixth man on my intramural team at Central (Michigan)," he quipped.

But DeVilling also played at Athens with Royce. His other claim to fame is once traveling to Milwaukee, Wis., to compete in a Pepsi Hot-Shot Contest along with John McIntyre, former all-star at Redford Catholic Central now playing professionally in Israel.

That leaves me, whose role was to rebound, set screens and play good defense — and look good in warm-ups.

With our next game scheduled for 11 a.m. the next morning against one of the division favorites, it was wise to follow a disciplined training regime.

Unfortunately, DeVilling and I accidentally walked past my car after the tournament and ended up

walking another three miles before finding it.

I don't know how much good that did us.

Our first game Sunday was played up to 15 by 0 and we narrowly won again, 16-13, over the eventual division runner-up Black-top Players. Again, George buried a two to win the game but the most important shot might have been a two-pointer by DeVilling with a man in his face to put us up 14-13.

DeVilling also made a key coaching move, bringing me in for him as a defensive replacement at crunch time.

I can't ever remember being used as a defensive specialist.

After a long rain delay, we lost our last two games to be eliminated but I left at least with the satisfaction of finally scoring a couple of points. We also gained a third-place trophy, which went home with DeVilling.

"If you want to look at it come by the apartment," DeVilling said.

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Madonna adding basketball strength

The time a college basketball coach spends between the end of his recruiting and the start of the season is wonderful. The influx of new players sends his optimism soaring higher than a jump ball; there are no injuries to worry about, no bad officials to fret over, no missed buzzer shots to lament.

Every team is a world-beater — or at least a title-contender — during this time. And that includes a team like Madonna University's women's squad, which is entering only its second season after the near-disaster of 1990-91, when the schedule was forfeited after a rash of early injuries.

Bill Potter took over the program in May of 1991. He was faced with putting together an entire team before the start of classes in September, not an easy task. He did it, and the Lady Crusaders performed creditably, posting a 7-17 overall record and going 5-7 in the NAIA's District 23.

Foundation intact

With a foundation to build upon and more time to devote to recruiting, Potter was expecting big things this year. And for the most part — even taking into consideration a coach's normal tendency toward optimism — he got them.

"We were looking for diversity," the Madonna coach said, "someone who could play two or three positions for us."

A second important need was depth. Injuries ravaged Madonna again last season, leaving the Crusaders with just six healthy

players at times.

With only three players lost — Lori Creten, a sophomore who left school to return home to Escanaba; Karen Sangregorio, who's decided to devote her full attention to her studies in her senior year; and walk-on Janette Rioux, who transferred to Oakland University — Potter had a solid returning corps.

Leading scorer Jill Burt is back, and so are starters Cheri Sangregorio, Lyndell Ingalls and Stephanie Niebauer. Others returning are Marianne Ervin, Kim Kibbey and Samantha Yesh.

As he did last year, Potter went to a source he knew for his recruiting: Oakland Community College, where Potter served as an assistant coach before getting the Madonna post. Three of his five additions have an OCC background, bringing the team total to six.

Big guns coming

At the top of the list must be Lori Montante, a 5-foot-9 guard who left OCC two years ago and enrolled at Oakland University. She never played for the Pioneers — an ankle injury kept her sidelined — and when she decided to major in education, she transferred to Madonna.

Montante will have junior eligibility. At OCC in 1990, she was an all-Region 12 selection after averaging 20 points a game. Scoring is her forte; she led Oakland County in points scored during both her junior and senior years at Milford HS, averaging over 25 points both seasons.

"She's going to bring us some instant offense," said Potter. "She has a three-point shot, and she can also drive to the basket."

The other two OCC recruits are

Stephanie Creley, a 5-11 do-everything from Fenton, and Dana Sevech, a 5-6 point guard from Waterford Our Lady of the Lakes. Creley will have sophomore status; Sevech will be a junior.

Creley "will do everything for us," said Potter, noting that she's the type of player who will make Madonna more diversified. "She can play all five spots, and she has three-point range, too. She can guard centers and guards."

Creley averaged 10.5 points and seven rebounds while playing 38 minutes a game for OCC last year.

"She's an unbelievable passer," said Potter. "We may put her and (returning point guard) Lyndell (Ingalls) side by side."

The two freshmen Potter is bringing in won't necessarily be confined to the end of the bench. "I'm not too set on a starting lineup right now," he said. "If a freshman or sophomore outplays a junior or senior, she'll play."

That probably sounds just fine to Mary Bieniewicz, a 5-10 guard-forward from Farmington Hills Mercy, and Emily Chedister, a 5-9 forward from Davison.

Bieniewicz comes from the kind of program that Potter — and every other coach — likes. "She comes from a real strong program," he said. "So she's fundamentally strong. She'll give us a little offense and a little defense. And she takes it to the basket real well."

Take a mini vacation, have lunch at Bates Street Cafe on the new Van Dusen Terrace on the north side of the Community House at 380 Bates Street in downtown Birmingham.

Made possible by a gift from Helen Van Dusen (Mrs. C. Theron) of Bloomfield Hills in recognition of her family and their involvement in the greater Detroit metro area, the brick terrace seats 125 people, and is landscaped with flowers, shrubbery and 16 tall shade trees. Some of the tables have umbrellas.

Bates Street Cafe is also open 5:30-7:30 p.m. Thursdays. After dinner, walk across the street to Shain Park to listen to the free concert which starts at 7:30 p.m. The Birmingham/Bloomfield Symphony Orchestra is performing tonight, "Blackthorn" & "Kitty Heinzman Celtic Dancers," will take the stage 7:30 p.m. Thursday, July 23. Concerts are scheduled 7:30 p.m. on Thursdays through Aug. 27.

Small acts often have grave consequences. This is the central theme of Canadian novelist Robertson Davies' Deptford Trilogy, a complex examination of the good, the evil and the banal.

Elliot Hayes has fashioned a new dramatic version of the last novel in this trilogy "World of Wonders." The

presentation at the Avon Theater is a valiant effort to deal with philosophy through drama by drawing on the horrific and magical in the novel. It is a production blessed by solid acting and some clever effects but is never quite magical enough to overcome murkiness and pedantry.

"World of Wonders" is the story of Magnus Eisengrim, a world famous magician at the end of his days. A television producer has come to persuade the magician to allow a biographical documentary. Magnus' two closest friends recount the true story of Eisen-

grim's very grim life.

Through dreamlike flashbacks into which the adult characters intrude and offer commentary, we are shown a story of Dickensian horror. Eisengrim's life begins with a thoughtless act that has wide reverberations. Subsequently, he is sexually abused by a carnival illusionist, kidnapped into a freak show, patronized by a grand theatrical couple of the old school and finally elevated to worldwide acclaim. Behind all of this is a mystery involving a misthrown stone and the peculiar death of a friend.

The pluses here are many. Though

the characters are not all well defined, they are well played. Stratford stalwart Nicholas Pennell is a flamboyant but haunted Eisengrim. Leon Pownall is forcefully blunt as his friend Ramsay. Pat Galloway is sardonic, intellectual, a character from a German expressionist work as the deformed Liesl. Other fine performances are given by Douglas Chamberlain, Peter Donaldson and Edward Atienza (in two quite dissimilar but related roles as Eisengrim's tormentor and mentor).

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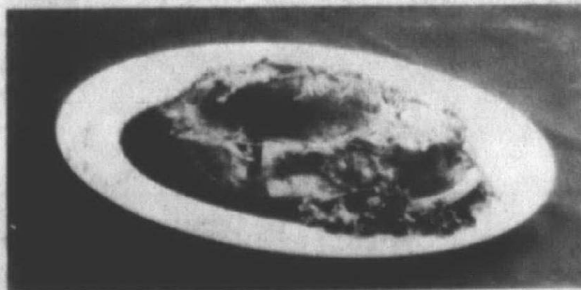
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Melodrama keeps audience laughing

The Birmingham-based Three Guys Productions' first effort, an original work, could very well be re-titled "Talent, Talent, Talent!" but instead carries the appropriate title "Foiled Again!"

The three guys — Gerry Castle, Mike Vigilant and Dan Castle, have created two side-splitting musical-ettes; each act is a musical within itself. Act 1 is "Curse You, Jack Dalton!" Act 2 is "He Ain't Done Right By Nell."

The original music by Gerry Castle is lively, and a superb match to the witty lyrics of Mike Vigilant. Tying the musical knot is Wilbur Braun's books which both include a villain, a lady in distress, a hero to save her, and a curmudgeonly old

woman. Hilarious dialogue flows smoothly into comic and sometimes bawdy song. The story and music, however, seem an appropriately incidental backdrop for jokes and an absolutely wonderful time.

Director Bill Haycock, Music Director Gerry Castle, Choreographer Carollee Castle and Vocal Director Sally Castle, squeeze every nuance from the material to provide an uproarious evening of melodramatic/farical entertainment. The fast-paced show never stops the gags, jokes and movement.

Before the show begins, the audience is warned by a flight attendant of several rules, the two most important are, "Do not crinkle irritating, little cellophane wrappers," and "Feel free to boo or hiss at the villain, or cheer for the hero." In other words, audience participation is a must.

Act 1 is unbridled British melodramatic humor which alternately provides the shenanigans of "Laugh In," Benny Hill, and perhaps, just a twist of Carol Burnett. Onstage chemistry crackles and Cindy Pritchard and Dan Castle dance, sing and joke through Act 1 as Bertha and Jack, secret lovers who cannot

keep their plump hands from dipping into cupcakes, Little Debbie's and the like.

Dan Castle as Jack is a combination of Jackie Gleason, Bud Costello and John Belushi. He is absolutely hilarious while crooning "Bertha," a song which takes wide poetic license with such wonderfully, mentally abusive lyrics as "Bertha, Bertha, you're the most precious thing on Earth!"

With exaggerated quivering-lips and fluttering eyelashes, Pritchard is the perfect coquette, and has mastered the art of musical melodrama. Her smokey, jazzy song, "Chemistry," is a true entertainment gem.

Sharon Hendricks and Diana Marie Balsam give marvelous performances as Mother Dalton and Anna, an opportunistic, money hungry woman who is vying for Mother Dalton's son's affections. Their duet, "Men Are Animals," stops the show, and their comic timing is flawless.

Steve Tadevic plays Egbert (also called Egg Yolk, Egg Plant, Egg White, etc.), the evil villain ("Boo! Hiss!"). Tadevic possesses irrefut-

able comic timing during his funny "The Best Darn Thing My Heart Has Ever Seen" while reluctantly ogling ugly duckling Eloise (Tania L. Velinsky).

Ken Ebaugh portrays Richard, the hero ("Hooray!") who comes to save the day. Ebaugh's performance is polished; he offers a nice equilibrium for the remainder of the cast. Velinsky plays a very energetic and zany Eloise.

Between the story line, Act 1 interjects from across the century from the "Wizard of Oz" and "Les Melodrambles" (A "Forbidden Broadway" style spoof from "Les Miserables"). Act 2 provides more of the same fun and frolic, but instead of the the British farce style, Act 2 is "The Rocky Horror Picture Show" meets "Hee Haw."

Three Guys Productions' premiere work, "Foiled Again!" is a wonderful opportunity to laugh.

Some good performances in DSO concert

Artistic integrity can be a costly commodity in our present cultural environment. All too often it seems unaffordable when one has to consider its limited appeal, and the declining financial support by a

government that is hostile to the arts. This was the reason behind the elimination of the Classical Series at the Meadow Brook Music Festival this summer, and its substitution by a lighter pop series with the hope that it would attract greater crowds.

The selling of artistic integrity for hard cash is a difficult step for a true artist. The sense of frustration is multiplied when the compensating cash fails to materialize.

This was the case at Meadow Brook on July 10 when the Detroit Symphony Orchestra with its music director Neeme Jarvi presented a program based on the old Disney movie "Fantasia." There were even more empty seats and deserted areas on the lawn than one could witness in previous seasons with the regular heavy duty programs.

Most of the selections, to be sure,

are not objectionable in themselves, and could be incorporated into a more substantial program. The one exception is the Stokowski arrangement of Bach's Toccata and Fugue which, in my opinion, is among the worst tasteless monstrosities, and gross desecrations of a work of art. Much as with many elections, however, I am reconciled with the fact that mine is destined to remain a minority view.

This is not meant to be a denunciation of fun and entertainment, which I do enjoy as much as anyone else. But an entire summer without any program of more tangible substance is analogous to several months of a steady diet of low calorie ice cream. The menu on that program, in its manner of presentation, could not be analogous even to real, full bodied ice cream.

There were some individual efforts that deserve full credit, to be sure. Among them is that of WQRS announcer Dave Wagner, who hosted the program, and was shedding light on the light subject in a very light way. Among the soloists, harpist Patricia Masri Fletcher was impressive in her virtuosic solo parts in the "Dance of the Flowers" from Tchaikovsky's "Nutcracker Suite." So were assistant trumpet principal Stephen Andersen and concertmaster Emanuelle Boisvert

in the arrangement by Moses of Schubert's Ave Maria. The name of the arranger not withstanding, this was not quite the version that came down to us from Mount Sinai.

Jarvi attempted to breathe life into the music by creating some unusual effects. Some of those, however, sounded contrived, such as the slowed scales in the "Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy." Among other movements of this suite, which appeared in a different order than printed on the program, the "Arabian Dance" was stretched out to the extent that it appeared as long as the Sahara Desert.

Among the few items that sounded credible were Dukas' Sorcerer's Apprentice and Mussorgsky's Night on Bald Mountain. The Dance of the Hour from La Gioconda emerged radiant and entertaining with its popular themes.

Among the noteworthy unscheduled features was some extraordinary virtuoso balalaika play-

ing by Genady Zut, who immigrated here from Russia. His rendition of Liszt's Rhapsody No 2, with piano accompaniment, pushed his instrument far beyond its conventional outer limits. This was followed by some Russia folk themes.

As a partial atonement for the light content of the program, Jarvi presented the Prelude to the third act of Wagner's Lohengrin as an encore. This short piece, has indeed, more substance than the rest of the program combined.

While maintaining artistic integrity may be difficult under present circumstances, this event proves that its compromise can be even more costly. This should be a good reason for restoring artistic content to Meadow Brook next season.

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Zany radio crew tackles leukemia

At rock radio station WLLZ in Farmington Hills, things can get a little crazy when J.J. and the Morning Crew are on the air.

With Jim Johnson at the controls and airwaves cohort George Baier switching between his character voices of The Bruiser, Bob Rashbuns, Al Kaline and others faster than you can hit your radio's scan button, even your basic Byron McGregor newscast can become a hilarious episode.

Few topics are hallowed to this raucous cast, but one thing the morning crew is serious about is its fund-raising efforts for the Leukemia Society. They began a month of preparation with a fund-raising art show July 8 of the John Lennon Imagine exhibit at the Omni International in Detroit.

But the long haul will begin July 30, when J.J. and The Morning Crew broadcast from the studio for 28 hours straight for the radio station's third annual Leukemia Radiothon.

Approached by hundreds of charitable organizations a year, disc jockey Jim Johnson said the disease of leukemia seemed like an area where the station could make a difference.

"A lot of groups do research, which is good, but they're not finding any cures," Johnson said. "Leukemia seems to be something they've made great strides in. People with the disease are living through it now."

Being able to see tangible results of their efforts is encouraging as well, Johnson said. In the last few years, the crew at WLLZ has come to know Denny Sims, a young boy with leukemia, pretty

well. He became involved with the organization as a poster child and began visiting the station during the radiothon.

"We've been following him for years," Johnson said. "He's cured now and it's great to be able to watch him growing up."

According to Karen Pyle, director of the Michigan chapter of the Leukemia Society, the station's radiothon is the chapter's largest and most lucrative fundraiser. The air wave marathon netted more than \$90,000 in its first year, 1990, and more than \$100,000 last year. All funds raised go to help pay for treatment of the more than 900 Michigan leukemia patients registered with the organization. A seven-year-old chapter, Pyle said WLLZ's efforts have

been integral to the group's growth in recent years.

"It's unheard of that a radio station would virtually shut down business to help out something like this program," Pyle said. "It just blew us away when this started. We couldn't believe that their audience could bring in that much money."

During the morning ruffian's 28 hours on the air, another crew will

be answering telephones taking pledges from callers. For a donation of \$50 or more, callers may also make a song request, which will be played during the radiothon.

Among the unique items they'll be auctioning off during the show are an autographed Van Halen guitar, a VIP pass at a golf club, a WLLZ T-shirt autographed by Bruce Springsteen.

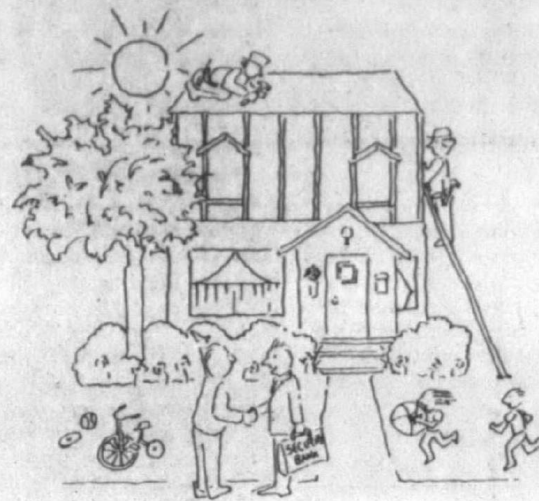

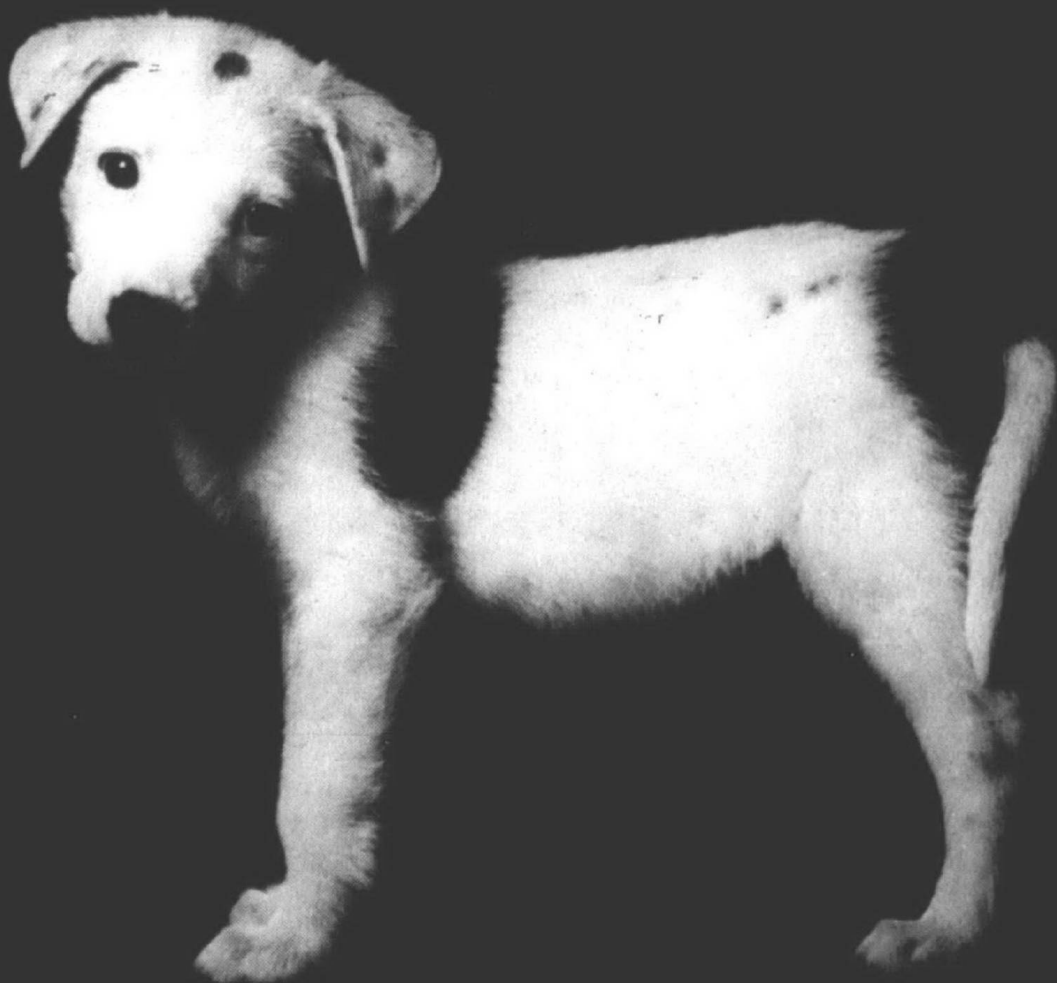

Jewelry offered for sale through video

■ Borrowing an idea from the home shopping networks, two entrepreneurs are hoping they can sell jewelry via video by selling more conveniently and less expensively than other retailers.

Build a better mousetrap and the world will beat a path to your door; video tape a jewelry store and you'll get in the customer's door.

That, at least, is the hopes behind a new venture being launched by Birmingham natives Glenn M. Wachler and Jeff Linklater.

The two have formed Video Shopping Club, a jewelry and gift warehouse that keeps its inventory at the manufacturer and uses the consumer's television as its showroom.

"I've been around jewelry my whole

life," said Wachler, whose family owns David Wachler & Sons Jewelers. A little more than three years ago, Wachler said he decided to cut out on his own.

That's when he began operating Gem World Co., a shop-at-home and office jewelry service. Linklater joined the firm last year.

"Being able to distribute on video has given us an opportunity to reach people we might not have had," Wachler said. Home jewelry shows have been rewarding, he said, but it was limited in the number of people who could be reached.

Wachler said the two were driving on a business trip between Birmingham

and Grand Rapids when the idea came to them. "It seemed like we could describe something better with video than the written word."

Linklater noted, "I've read through jewelry catalogs and even I can't always tell what exactly I'm buying. On video, you can see how something really looks. You can turn it and twist it in the light and see it how it really is."

The look is classic

The forerunner to the idea, the two admit, is the home video shopping networks that have cropped up on cable television. Linklater noted that the industry earned more than a billion in revenues last year.

"But we didn't want to be like that," he said. Those networks sell lower qual-

ity merchandise at outrageously quoted discounts.

"In America, you can't buy a watch for \$200 when the list price is \$1,000," Wachler added. "We don't want to slam something down people's throats. Television tries to catch the spur-of-the-moment buyer — our videos are not meant to be hard sell."

When they were knocking around ideas on how they could expand their business, their game plan was two-fold: sell more conveniently and less expensively.

The idea, they decided, is to sell "classic" jewelry that never goes out of style, rather than elaborate pieces that few would want, Wachler said. Custom pieces and special occasion, expensive jewelry for the corporate executive wife

Working couple raises financial questions before starting family

Local financial planning experts reviewed the data of the family profiled here and made general recommendations based on the participants' resources and goals. "This time, like all times, is a very good one if we but know what to do with it," Ralph Waldo Emerson's words are as true today as they were when first spoken in 1837. They certainly apply to this month's profiled couple, Bob and Sara Temple.

Both are 32 and have computer-related careers. Bob works for EDS and earns \$37,000, and Sara is a computer specialist for a smaller manufacturer, earning \$35,000. Their biggest concern is making sure they are doing those things necessary to move them toward their long-term and short-term financial goals.

They have been married for three years and are hoping to start a family next year. They would like to start planning for education expenses right after the child is born. At this point, Sara plans to continue working full-time.

They would like to buy a larger home in perhaps five years. When asked about their most important goal, Bob replies, "We feel that it is important to start a long-term savings plan while maintaining a comfortable current lifestyle."

Lack master plan

They have not yet started any significant retirement savings because their focus has been saving for the home they bought last year. They have managed to avoid significant debt, borrowing only for their home and cars. With two steady incomes, they have the ability to start a retirement savings plan while still meeting current goals.

As a couple just getting started in planning their financial future, we would recommend that they read "The Wealthy Barber" by David Chilton. This easy-to-read book is an excellent source of basic financial planning information in an entertaining format.

They ask, "How much should we be putting away toward retirement? What is the best place for these dollars?" Both are fortunate to have a deferred compensation arrangement available through their employer. Under this plan, they agree to re-

duce their current salaries by a specific amount. These dollars are placed into an account that earns interest until they retire. Both the amount contributed and the interest are not taxable to them until they receive it, so there is a significant tax advantage.

Employer plan benefits

We'd suggest that each of them place 10 percent of their salaries into this deferred compensation plan. This is the single most important thing they can do for their financial future. For individuals in their 30s who are eligible for company pension plans (like Bob and Sara), 10 percent of income placed in retirement savings is frequently sufficient to meet long-term needs.

Because of the longtime horizon for the investment of these funds, the majority of their deferred compensation should be allocated to

growth accounts that invest in stocks.

Bob also has access to an employer stock purchase plan, which allows him to buy EDS stock at a 15 percent discount. He should take advantage of this. Although there may be some risk in the ownership of the stock, the 15 percent bonus significantly reduces this risk. This money might be earmarked for the purchase of their new house in five years. Though the stock has to be held for at least two years before it can be sold, Bob should subsequently watch for a good time to sell his stock and lock in a profit.

They also requested information on the types of insurance they should purchase. They both have excellent health and disability policies through their employers. The only weakness in their auto and homeowners policies are their coverages for liability, currently at \$100,000 in each policy.

Liability coverage of \$100,000 is inadequate in these days of high court judgments. They should increase this amount to \$300,000 or \$500,000. The cost of this increase would be perhaps \$30 per year.

Insurance a weakness

They carry only the life insurance provided by their employers at two times their annual salaries or about \$75,000 each. They ask, "Is this adequate? How should we change our coverage when we have a child?"

We would recommend that they own a personal policy. Their current insurance would not even cover the mortgage should either of them pass away, and they are dependent on two incomes to support their current lifestyle. At this time, \$100,000 of additional personal coverage would be a minimum. This also gives them insurance protections should they leave their current employers.

At the time they have their child, their situation should be reviewed. They may very well need to increase their coverage again. The point is to plan their insurance program, rather than simply purchasing whatever they feel inclined to buy at any given time. If they just need temporary coverage during the period that their child is growing up, they might check with their employers to find out whether additional optional coverage is available through their employers' group plans.

They have no estate plan. At this time, simple wills that include naming a personal representative for their respective estates and detailing their distribution desires would be adequate. They may also want to create a durable power of attorney that allows them to manage their financial affairs more easily if one of them becomes incapacitated.

This simple estate plan would be fine until they have a child, at which point they should review it with their attorney.

is not their balliwick.

"The trick is getting the jewelry into people's hands who will buy," Wachler said.

Low overhead

The video catalog, which customers can view at their leisure in their homes, fulfilled the convenience aim and it also established the groundwork for selling less expensively.

Without the overhead of owning a retail location and hiring a sales staff, the two could offer jewelry at a substantial savings, Wachler said. Which doesn't mean there were no obstacles to setting up the venture.

"We didn't have a tremendous amount of capital to work with so we were fortunate to find several jewelry manufacturers who would work with us."

To keep costs low — it was im-

portant to keep overhead down — that meant no inventory of jewelry. After flying to New York and negotiating for several weeks, the two were able to convince several manufacturers to loan them several hundred thousand dollars worth of jewelry for their video.

The other hurdle, Wachler said, was to find a way to distribute. Obviously, they couldn't go the traditional retail route. They've settled on four basic distribution methods.

Distributor network

The first is a network of independent distributors who purchase memberships at wholesale and then sell them for the suggested price of \$20. "Our independent distributor is not a salesperson; they are a channel to the customer," Wachler said.

"We don't want people misrepresenting what we're selling and we don't have time to train them," he said. "The video catalog is the salesperson." *

Each person who buys a membership is given a club identification number, he said. In addition to any profits earned in the sale of memberships, independent distributors earn a commission when a club member purchases an item from the catalog.

Wachler has also made arrangements for organizations to sell video club memberships as a fund-raising mechanism. Instead of an individual selling memberships and gaining a commission, the group would be the beneficiary.

Wachler and Linklater are also planning on distributing the video catalog through video rental stores and mass market retail outlets.

"Our target audience is the working, professional woman who shops at the catalog showrooms for jewelry," Linklater said. That market, he said, spends between \$200 and \$500 on jewelry each year.

Merchandise in the video catalog ranges from simple pieces costing \$35 to more elaborate items priced as high as \$8,500.

"There are some people who will never buy this way," he said. "We expect most of our customers will convert from catalog showrooms."

Wachler said some of the best customers so far have been people in small towns who would have to travel miles to find jewelry otherwise. "We've even talked of setting up some of the hair salons and florists in smaller communities as independent distributors," he said.

"We feel that may eventually be our niche," Wachler said.

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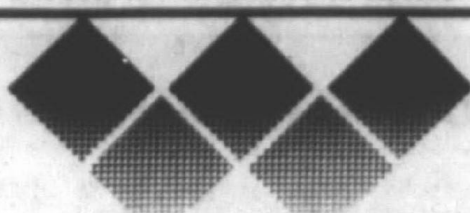

New book has what it takes to stay young

Old age. It happens to all of us. Some of us see it as a curse, others as a challenge. There's no way of avoiding it, but there are ways of delaying it. Just ask Kathy Keeton.

It's obvious Keeton, the author of "Longevity: The Science of Staying Young" (Viking, \$24), practices what she preaches. She doesn't look a day over 35 even though she's 53. And, if she has her way, she'll live to age 120.

"There's so many things I want to do and see," said Keeton on wanting to live so long. "I want to die as late as possible."

Based on the belief that each and every person holds the power to lengthen their life, Keeton has spent four years working with researchers to come up with the definitive book on staying young.

While it contains as much information as an encyclopedia, the book shouldn't be mistaken for a reference work. What Keeton does is examine the latest in anti-aging theories and take a close look at the many things available today to delay the aging process... to keep people looking, acting and feeling younger than they are.

The depth of the work reflects her almost lifelong interest in living longer. It was her grandmother, she said, who got her interested in the subject as a young child.

"I had a grandmother who taught me that middle age started at 70," she said. "She lived until she was 98 and died in her sleep. She exercised daily, ate chicken, fish, fruit and vegetables... all those things doctors want us to do now."

The wife of Bob Guccione of *Penthouse* magazine fame, Keeton's first brush with the issue of longevity came in an article on scientific efforts to extend the human life span that appeared in her first issue of *Omni*, the leading consumer science lifestyle magazine.

Response to the article was so great that Keeton kept printing articles about aging. That in turn led to her founding of *Longevity*, a magazine dedicated to the art and science of staying young, in 1986.

For all ages

Admittedly, the book is geared for younger people, but what Keeton puts forth in the book are things that even older people should be doing to revitalize their lives.

"The human life span is 115-120 years (the optimum number of years you could live) and the life expectancy (the number of years you do live is around 70)," Keeton said. "A number of people are living into their 80s, 90s and beyond and it's important to keep these people active."

"The reality is that everybody should be doing this whether they're 18 or 80."

Keeton's lifestyle includes an hour workout each day — "It's wonderful." She also indulges in fruit peel masques and collagen injections, watches her diet and uses vitamin therapy to keep her youthful appearance.

In fact, her vitamin therapy is a supplement package of 40 different minerals and vitamins, developed by Michael Colgan of the Colgan Institute. Colgan believes each person has his or her own vitamin profile. He does extensive series of blood tests, hair and nail analysis and a comprehensive lifestyle questionnaire to determine exactly what supplements in what amount should be taken.

The basics

But, she stresses staying younger doesn't involve just one change in a lifestyle. Massive doses of vitamins isn't going to hold back the wrinkles or keep the physique sleek. Staying off aging involves 10 "very, very basic" things that "will change your lifestyle and your attitude about life," she said.

Some of those basics? Some are simple like eating right, using a sunscreen and getting more exercise. Keeton also recommends staying slim by not dieting. Rather than a life of up and down weight gains, she favors finding a weight that you feel comfortable with and keep it relatively constant.

She also recommends the power of love. Experts have found that strong emotional bonds pay off in better health and longer life and, while the jury is still out on sex and longevity, it does help lower the blood pressure, relieve arthritic pain and alleviate insomnia, Keeton said.

"If you look in the mirror and you look good, then that makes you feel good," she said. "And if you feel good, it helps your immune system and makes you treat others better."

Keeton is pleasantly surprised with the response to her book.

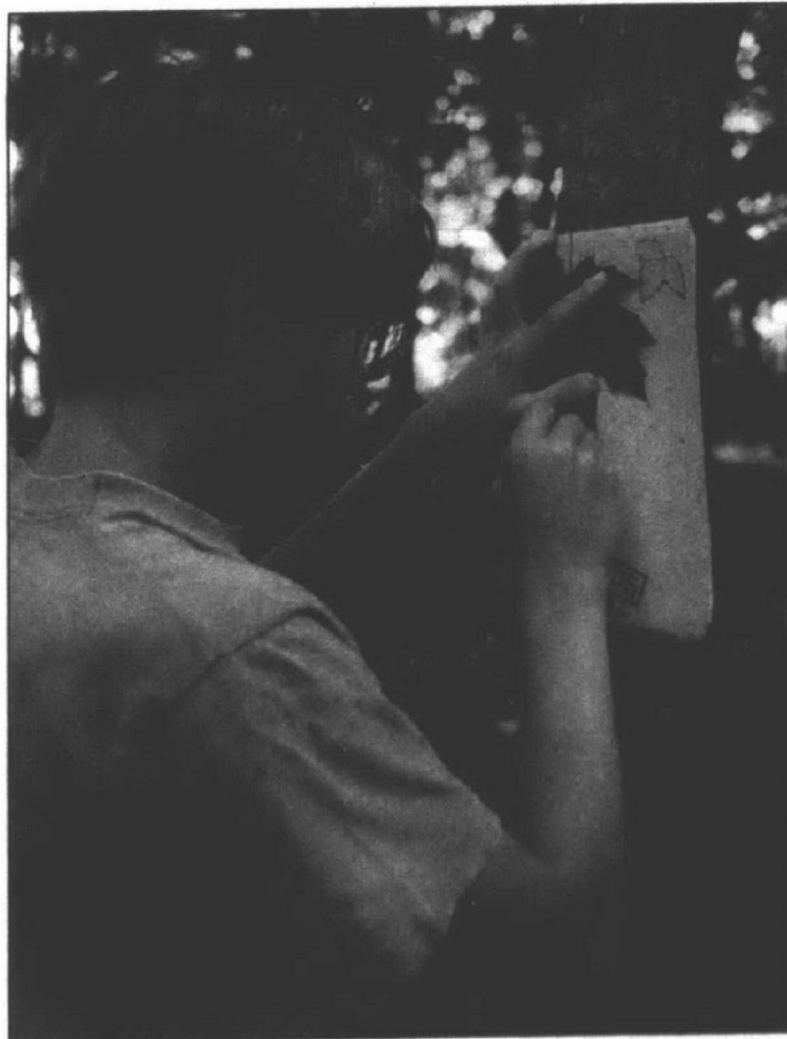

School it is, a new summer program being offered to middle school students in Plymouth-Canton. And from the sounds of it, it's a big hit with both the kids and the teachers.

Brent Kossick and Brian Welton can chew gum in school these days, and not have to worry about getting in any trouble.

The boys, seventh graders at East Middle School in Plymouth, are participating in a Plymouth-Canton summer school program. The program, based at West Middle School, includes 150 students.

"Actually, it's kind of fun," said Brian, 11. "No homework" is one thing he likes about the four-week program, being offered for the first time this summer.

He, Brent and the others have been taking "A Look at Michigan." Students, most in seventh and eighth grades with a few sixth graders, have been studying math, language arts and other subjects as they relate to Michigan.

"It's fun," said Brent, 12. "I like the easy work, I like no homework." He's been studying fractions, "things about Michigan and the ships that have sunk, shipwrecks. And we're learning to read better."

Sessions are held four mornings a week at West Middle School.

"We tried to give it a camp flavor, more than a traditional school," said Karen Tripp-Oppe, director and lead teacher. Students can chew gum; boys are allowed to wear their hats indoors, something that isn't permitted during

the regular school year.

Mary Fritz, a Plymouth-Canton school administrator, wrote a grant proposal, and the district received program funding through the state Department of Education. Student participants were identified based on MEAP test scores, grades and teacher observations.

Some are reluctant readers and writers, while others need help with math skills, Tripp-Oppe said. Students aren't necessarily learning disabled, but all have strengths and areas where they need some assistance.

"For some, it was self-esteem." Students who have difficulty with reading are benefitting from literature discussions this summer, she said. In their regular classes, students may tend to take a back seat to classmates who lead the discussions.

This summer, students have been learning how to understand and enjoy literature. "They're not competing with those kids they view as smarter," said Tripp-Oppe, a Plymouth resident.

A number of field trips are included in the middle school program, which began in late June. On Thursday, July 9, students, teachers and aides went to Maybury State Park in Northville Township to do some math and measuring.

Teachers Ellison Franklin and Tracy Massel designed the Maybury math hike, which included use of metric mea-

combined magic and ventriloquism.

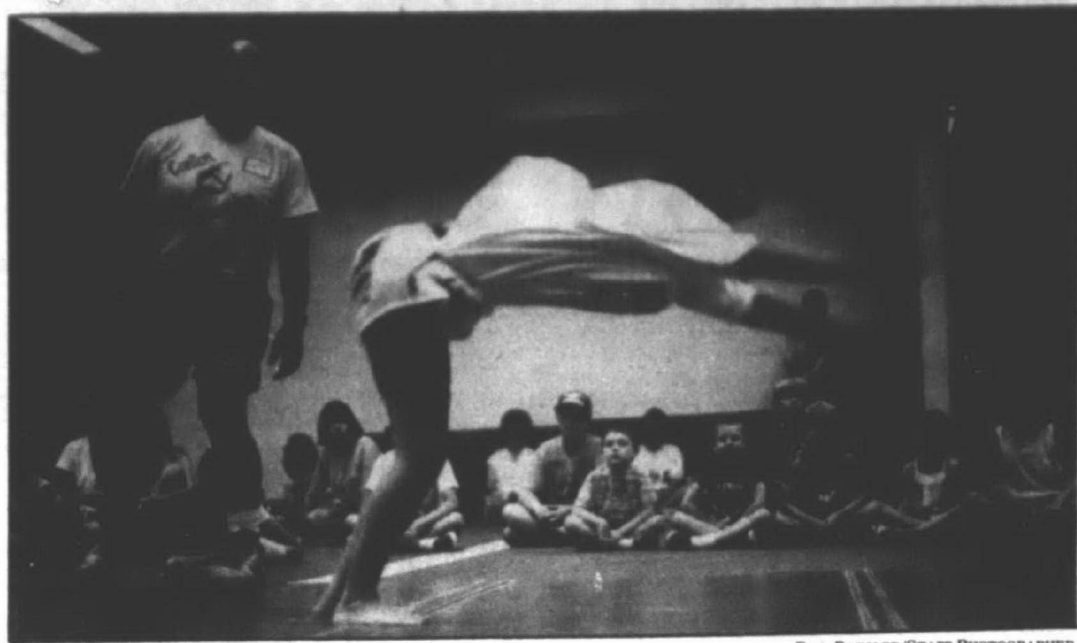
"Engineering was a little bit different from this," said Haddrill, who grew up in Dearborn Heights and earned a bachelor's degree in aerospace engineering from U-M. He worked as an air-to-air combat analyst with Boeing Co. in Seattle, Wash., and as a co-op student with McDonnell Douglas Corp. in St. Louis, Mo.

He began doing magic while in college, although his vaudeville/musical performances go back to early childhood. Haddrill and his father, a musician and music teacher, often performed together.

He does educational programs at schools and promotional programs at libraries and shopping centers, along with birthday parties, Scout gatherings and other functions.

Haddrill brought his puppet, Mury the cockatoo, to the Canton Public Library last week. School-

age youngsters in the audience enjoyed their ventriloquism show, along with a variety of magical feats.

surements.

One group of youngsters got started by determining what — length, area, volume or angle — would be used to describe the size of the parking lot. Students moved around the park in teams, figuring out such things as how many times the pump had to be pumped to fill a cup or the number of students it would take, one standing on top of another, to reach the flagpole's top.

"They're collaborating really well," Tripp-Oppe said. "We try to

mix them up, so they have to work with different people."

Teachers and aides had expected youngsters would have more difficulty concentrating on their studies in the summer. Instead, the kids get involved in a project and forget to watch the clock.

"All of a sudden, 55 minutes is gone," Tripp-Oppe said. "My biggest frustration is I don't have more time with them."

Students will receive an evaluation at the end of the program,

rather than letter grades. They've been keeping "Captain's Logs," daily journals.

Reading the book "Brothers of the Heart" by Joan Blot is part of the program, and the Ann Arbor author will speak to the students later this month. An all-day field trip to Lansing, including stops at the capitol and state museum, is also planned.

Tripp-Oppe knows students benefit from learning about their own state. Fifth graders in the

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools have a study unit on Michigan, and she likes to see those efforts continued.

"Oh, absolutely. I really believe it should be revisited every year because their appreciation will develop and grow." Knowledge will serve students well for their rest of their lives.

"They don't realize how much Michigan has for entertainment and recreation."

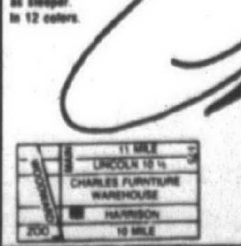

Making room for God takes time

The Rev. Jack Williams most likely won't be interested in starting a major home improvement project anytime soon.

Williams is pastor of the Plymouth United Assembly of God. He and other worshipers at the church on North Territorial in Plymouth Township are finishing up an extensive building project.

"We purchased the property a number of years ago," said Williams, 52, of Plymouth Township. The vacant property was bought in the late 1970s, and in 1986 the first phase of the building project was completed.

"It took us a little longer than we anticipated." That first phase included a fellowship hall, classrooms and most of the landscaping.

Previously, members had worshiped in a building on Ann Arbor Trail in Plymouth Township. That building was sold and now is the Plymouth Baptist Church.

When United Assembly of God worshipers moved to the North Territorial address in the mid-1980s, they met for services in the fellowship hall downstairs, which seats approximately 300. That facility was a bit cramped, but worshipers have more room in the new sanctuary.

The second phase of the project included the addition of a sanctuary with seating for approximately 600. Staff offices were added as well.

Worshipers began using the new sanctuary in mid-April, and it was dedicated the final Sunday in May.

Total cost for the project was approximately \$2 million. The building sits on 10 1/4 acres of land.

Williams, who's served as the congregation's pastor for 13 years, is pleased to have the work done. "I would say total jubilation and somewhat relief too because it had

been longer than we'd anticipated."

The project was financed through several sources, including the sale of the previous church, fund-raising by members, and local banks. Many church members provided both financial contributions and good old-fashioned elbow grease.

"Our members actually did a good share of the labor up here," Williams said, looking around the sanctuary. Some helped with carpentry. Nearly all of the painting and staining of wood was done by church members.

One member who had experience creating Tiffany lamps did the stained glass windows for the sanctuary. Many pitched in to help with the constant cleanup that goes with construction.

"And of course giving a lot of the money," Williams said.

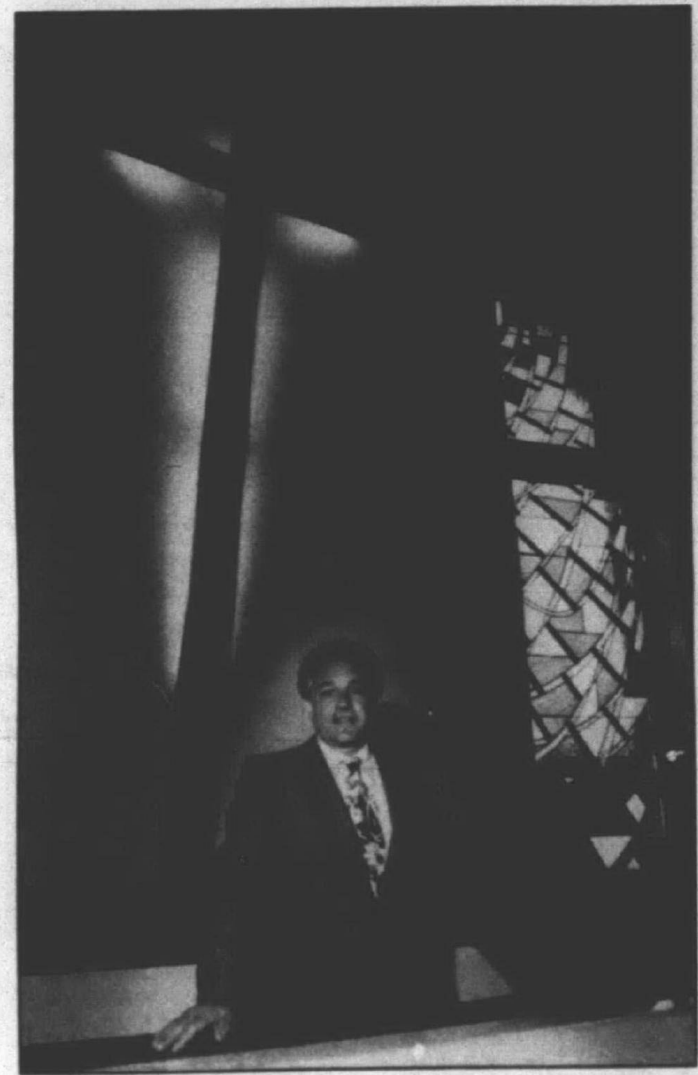
The church has approximately 350 members. Down the road, worshipers plan to add a gymnasium and expand the educational area "as the growth allows that or dictates it." The educational area now includes 16 classrooms and is laid out in a hexagonal shape.

Plymouth United Assembly of God members have noticed the extensive growth in western Plymouth Township in recent years.

"This is where the growth is coming. We're right in the middle of the growth. Everything is new since we've been out here," Williams said. "This was partly swamp and partly hills."

"The changes have been nothing but progressive, wonderfully progressive. The best community I've ever lived in."

Now that the project is just about done (there's some work left to do on the kitchen), United Assembly of God members have other goals in mind. Those include community outreach efforts, such as a recent multimedia patriotic presentation

at the church.

"Our real desire now is to let the community know we're here to serve them in any positive way we can," Williams said. "Just to be of service

to them, that's what we want to be. We're concentrating on really ministering to our community and trying to meet the needs of the community."

How we use language affects our perceptions of God

Language affects our perspective upon life.

How we use language also affects our perceptions of God. One Sunday a lawyer, who is a man, approached me and observed that I had used a male pronoun for God some 20 times in a worship hour. What difference does this make, I thought?

I resisted his suggestion that I change my language regarding God. My mind has changed. It does make a difference how we use language with regard to God.

Words for God are metaphors.

Metaphors matter. We know that God is not an old man up in the sky. Yet we focus upon familiar patterns of words. We will often defend them. Everything else may change in this world but do not ask me to stop referring to God as "he." Yes, words are important.

One day I offered a prayer in a group. At one point I said, "Father, Mother God." An older woman came up to me later and in an angry voice said, "Don't ever do that again or I will leave this church!" Language makes a difference.

It feels more familiar and secure to stick with the old versions. Security lies in sameness. Strong passions are aroused when we start raising questions about how we speak of God. Yet, it is a most important issue.

Changing words

A change of language makes us freshly aware of how God language connects us with other values. For example, if we have any concern about the ecological crisis of the

planet, our language may need to expand to phrases like, "Ever creating Spirit."

Maybe it doesn't sound as comforting as the word Father. Yet, if we reach for new metaphors for God we might expand our vision of what matters in the dawning of the 21st century.

Our God language is important. Language points us to ultimate concerns and values. Not only fathers are important to us as a new century dawns. The natural world, ending war and violence, racism, the value of each and every human being — these all need to be connected with our language for God.

Some time ago a film was made with the theme, "If God is Father, then we are all brothers and sis-

ters." This is a new definition of the word which points us to something more than an individualistic identification with God as my parent.

In working with our language for God we must not reduce the experience of God. Expand our words and images and we will expand our sense of God's reality. Multiply the images and reduce our dependence upon male-dominated words. God must not be kept in the religion and the individualistic box.

If God lives on our neighborhood street then how would we address God? If God reveals God's presence in the whole universe, in the issues of peace and justice, in the midst of human suffering and vulnerability, we will search for additional words. Much of this whole issue has to do

with how expanded our world is and how much we are willing to encounter mystery.

Breaking away

Whatever we do we need to break out of the exclusive male imagery. It is difficult to do this, but if we are unwilling we need to ask whether we are driven by fear to resist new, fuller more inclusive words.

Skilled psychologists can simply listen to a client and can pretty closely determine what is the structure of the person's life which is giving them a pain. It is simply a case of listening to language.

So it is with our language with God. If we are stuck with he and Father, then there is a potential rigidity which can collectively cause us pain.

Fear can be the focus of our struggle with language as we encounter God. If there is fear of making changes in our language it should remind us of our lack of love. The poet tells us of the question: "How many ways can I call thee my love?" If a person is afraid of expanding

language for God they need to ask the question of where fear and love come into this issue?

Language use with God needs to be an adventure. The adventure has to do with meaning and consciousness. Expand your use. God is honored not harmed by such a desire to reflect a larger reality. Get away from the male usage.

There is a final issue of God related to language. It is for many an issue of peace and justice. The word for peace in Hebrew is shalom. It is a particularly inclusive word. It means that each and everyone belongs. It is a wonderful word of hospitality. Peace includes everyone, especially those without power, often children and women.

How we use words and God tells us something about who is included and who is excluded. Shalom includes everyone.

Words for God are very personal. Yet God does not need to be defended against feminine or child oriented language. Language with regard to God is not an easy issue, but let us pursue the adventure.

Shortly after arriving on Sunday we attended a small gathering at Carnegie Hall hosted by Verner, Lipfert, Bernhard, McPherson and Hand, former Gov. James Blanchard's Washington law firm. The event honored Sen. Patrick Moynihan of New York and his wife. My husband Michael and I were greeted by the warm hospitality of the principals of the firm and had an opportunity to see my old Michigan friends, Jim and Janet Blanchard, Ralph Gerson, Bob Larson and Bob Smith.

A highlight for me, as an admirer of fine photographs, was seeing Richard Avedon, who photographed so many famous faces so brilliantly.

Our next stop was a reception given for the Michigan delegation by General Motors and hosted by Alan Smith. Among the beautifully displayed Saturns and Corvettes in the GM building, the delegates dined on potato-zucchini pancakes, beautifully presented vegetables, chicken tidbits and other hors d'oeuvres.

Among those from our area were Ron and Kitty Thayer, U.S. Rep. John and Debbie Dingell, the

Delegates discussed the choice of Sen. Al Gore as the vice presidential running mate for Gov. Bill Clinton with a positive tone. Women delegates looked forward to easing their women candidates center stage.

Plymouth again home for painter in acrylics

He mingled with the arts patrons in Palm Beach and Boca Raton while living in Florida from 1988 to 1991.

But moving back to his hometown of Plymouth, within walking range of Kellogg Park, and showing in the 1991 Art in the Park last summer proved to be something very special.

"It was good to be back in Plymouth," said Tom LeGault, an acrylicist and a 1974 Plymouth Salem High School graduate. "Getting away gave us a new perspective, a new appreciation, for the midwest."

While living in Florida, his family summered in Canton. He described Florida arts patrons as harder-edged, less-congenial than midwesterners. "Many were high-intense New Yorkers," he said.

At the 12th annual Art in the Park Saturday-Sunday, July 18-19, LeGault will show 40 original acrylics priced from \$100 to \$550.

He'll also unveil a line of large, contemporary landscapes — "wet-on-wet acrylics."

"Because they set up quickly, you have to move really fast on these big pieces. It's almost like sculpting the paint," he said. "I've shown some experimental pieces at shows and they were the first to fly out of the booth in the first 20 minutes."

LeGault works exclusively in acrylics: "I use them in a wide range — treating them like watercolors for traditional pieces, creating a thick buildup with a palette knife for abstract and contemporary pieces."

Early art start

LeGault got his art start at age 14 when "my sister dragged me to an evening art class in Plymouth."

"As a kid, I always played with clay and sculpted, but I had no idea I'd paint an incredible still life that first night in class. I didn't expect it to happen. It just did. It was just a progression from there."

At 18, he opened his first art studio.

Despite demand for his work from galleries and buyers, LeGault says he's having more fun now than after he caught the eye of a New York gallery and auction network while working in Florida.

"Flexibility to get out and about, instead of sticking to the studio, has put me in the fun zone," he said.

Starting in acrylics as a teenager let him hone a distinctive, dividend-paying style.

"There's a million artists in Florida," he said. "To have a New York gallery and auction operation pick out my work is a real compliment. I'm breaking and bending the rules, but getting away with it."

His move into contemporary themes over the last three years bridges his traditional landscapes and highly textured floral abstracts.

"I've just done a contemporary tree scene with a real simple, clean look, incorporating all three styles," LeGault said.

"People look at my work and think different artists are involved because it's so opposite," he said. "Basically, I'm a jack-of-all-trades."

LeGault is well known on the Midwest art show circuit for traditional water reflection scenes and a penchant for painting right in the booth at rapid-fire speed.

"Giving people a chance to watch a painting go from a raw canvas to a finished look adds to the overall interest level," he said. "There's no commercially produced techniques involved. It eliminates skepticism. I actually create some of my best pieces at shows."

To meet demand for his popular lighthouse and barn scenes, he'll soon add a series of signed, limited-edition lithographs.

Style now freer

Meanwhile, LeGault continues to loosen his style and tackle contemporary themes. As he sees it, larger contemporary homes have triggered a new market: larger contemporary paintings.

"I've done some contemporary harbor scenes completely with a palette knife," he said. "There's no brushwork involved. It suggests buildings and water but because it's done with a knife, it has a nice, soft 'wet on wet' look in pastel colors."

The trend toward contemporary has moved bouncing pastels or Sante Fe earth tones into the color scheme.

"Everything has shifted into balanced colors — for example, bouncing greens and lavenders off blues. It's subtle, not an abrupt blend," LeGault said.

"Even diehard traditionalists with barn or lighthouse scenes are seeing this unique use of new colors and not feeling threatened."

LeGault relishes the chance to experiment with technique and fine-tune his work. But he still hits the Midwest art show circuit 35 times a year: "After all, it's a people business I'm involved."

With painting a pastime-turned-profession, LeGault says he's busy looking for a new hobby — "one that doesn't have dollars attached to it."

Families, food, fun and art are on tap for fair goers this weekend in and around Kellogg Park. Art in the Park celebrates its 12th year by showcasing more than 300 exhibitors, 270 more than at the first fair in 1981.

Art in the Park will spotlight fine art and crafts by more than 300 exhibitors, adding a festive air to the streets and sidewalks in and around Kellogg Park in the heart of historic Plymouth Saturday-Sunday, July 18-19.

Artists and crafters from New York, North Carolina, California, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Virginia, West Virginia, Wisconsin and 110 Michigan communities will offer a bonanza of handmade artwork for browsing and buying. The fair began with 30 artists in 1981.

Fair-goers will choose from among hundreds of personal and home decor accents, including paintings, pottery, jewelry, basketry, Chinese brush painting, photography, wearable art, weaving, wood craft, calligraphy, and stained, blown and leaded glass.

"We're real excited about this year's show. There'll be more artists demonstrating and a lot more variety. New to this year's show are silhouette cuttings, weathervanes, big pieces of furniture, beautiful woodwork, fabric batik, marblizing and jewelry — everything from gold and diamonds to silver and dough," said Dianne Quinn, Art in the Park founder/producer.

Strolling musicians will accent the festivities. Barbry-ellen will perform North American folk songs while music by the Mike Burst Dulcimer Ensemble will add a medieval touch. Rochester musician Guy Sferlazzi and Chautauqua Express also will perform along with Trilogy, a mime group and clowns with balloons.

"The atmosphere is very festive and we have something for everyone's home, a unique individual piece," Quinn said.

Last year, 14 artists demonstrated their talents on Sunday under "The Gathering" on Penniman. This year, Quinn has asked artists to demonstrate on both days at locations throughout the fair, one of the largest arts and crafts fairs in the state.

Artist Tom LeGault of Plymouth will create traditional lighthouses and landscapes painted in a pink mist, and abstract florals created with a

Native American jewelry, rugs showcased

Navajo artist Sarah Natani has been weaving wool rugs for 40 years.

She'll demonstrate her award-winning skills on a five-foot loom during a Native American jewelry and Navajo rug show Friday-Sunday, July 17-19, at Native West Gallery, 863 W. Ann Arbor Trail, Plymouth.

"I think it's exciting that people can see a piece of American history being demonstrated right here in Michigan and that Sarah's so willing to share her cul-

ture with us," said Becky Dodson, Native West co-owner with husband, Doug.

Two leading New Mexico authorities on jewelry and rugs will accompany Natani. Edmond "Bing" Crosby of Albuquerque Mexico and Tom Wheeler of Waterflow will be on hand to answer questions about the Navajo culture as well as relay its myths and legends.

Crosby, who has more than 35 years' experience as a trader, will bring thousands of pieces of traditional and contemporary jewelry handcrafted from silver and gold by the Navajo, Hopi, Zuni and Santo Domingan.

"Bing will have a spectacular selection of jewelry,

the old and the new, thousands of pieces from \$4 to \$4,000, and he's willing to take special orders," said Dodson, a Farmington Hills resident.

Wheeler, fourth-generation owner of Hogback Trading Post established in 1971, will display traditional and contemporary Navajo rugs, old regional trading post patterns like Two Grey Hills, Wild Ruins, Burntwater, Ganado, Storm Pattern, and Teec Nos Pos as well as pictorial weavings of scenes from everyday life in Navajo culture.

"Tom Wheeler's a wealth of knowledge. He will talk about all aspects of Navajo rug making, from the carding of the wool to the spinning of it," Dodson said.

"Tom's still the largest supplier of Navajo rugs in America. He's going to bring hundreds of rugs priced from \$150 to \$12,000. At the last show, people asked for the lighter colors so he's also bringing lighter colors in traditional and contemporary styles."

Navajo weavers developed and refined their craft before the arrival of the Spanish. The Navajo loom is upright as opposed to the horizontal loom of the Mexican and Spanish-American weavers.

Demonstrations will run continuously throughout the show, from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Friday-Saturday, July 17-18, and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday, July 19. Natani expects to weave three inches during that time.

"I do very small weaving. Within a hundred years, it might wear out," Natani said in an interview from her home on the Navajo reservation in New Mexico. "I will show how to card wool and how to spin it. I usually bring some vegetal dye, what we use on the reservation."

Vegetal dyes are made by the Navajo from plants such as lupine, liatris, sunflower, alder

bark, snake weed, prickly pear cactus fruit, and elder, choke and black berries. Plants gathered for dye in summer and early fall produce richer colors, while plants gathered in winter and early spring provide colors lighter in shade.

Weaving skills are passed down through the generations of Navajo women. Designs for the rugs are not sketched before hand. Young weavers are taught to plan their pattern and colors in their head, to visualize it in its entirety from the beginning.

"Mom's a weaver. She taught me," Natani said. "Weaving, it relaxes you. You have lot of problems. It makes you forget all but weaving."

Shearing the sheep, washing the wool, gather-

ing plants for the dye and stringing the loom can take the Navajo many days or weeks of work before weaving begins.

"What I find most interesting is the Navajo's development and their history, the outside influences of the traders encouraging certain designs," said Plymouth resident Lisa Roberts, Native West assistant manager.

Roberts, who will receive her master's degree in art history from Wayne State University in April, spent untold hours researching materials and preparing handouts on the different styles of Navajo rugs in the show.

"Two Grey Hills has come to be known as the finest of all Navajo weaves with 90 to 130 threads per inch. Teec Nos Pos has an Oriental influence, probably from the photographs of Persian rugs that had been circulated among the weavers in the early 1900s by the traders," Roberts said.

"Even if people aren't interested in buying a rug, they should come and see them. They won't be able to see the rugs if they never go out West. It's a once in a lifetime opportunity."

Everyone who attends the show can enter the drawing for a Navajo rug at 5 p.m. Sunday.

Since retiring six years ago from Campbell Ewald after 29 years as an art director, Eddy devotes his energies to sketching and painting watercolors of homes and historic architecture on location. He will offer six different handcolored prints of notable sites in Plymouth, including Kellogg Park, Main Street, the Mayflower Hotel, Plymouth City Hall, Baker House and the gazebo.

"I knew I wanted to do some painting after I retired. I've been doing this (watercolor) since I was in high school," Eddy said. "It's what I'm happiest doing. I'm happiest when I'm painting."

Eddy studied commercial art and painting two years at Society for Arts and Crafts, since renamed Center for Creative Studies. He received a bachelor of art education degree in 1974 from Wayne State University.

"I took the advertising job because it gave me a chance to draw, to keep active in drawing," Eddy said. "I think it's drawing that drew me into advertising."

Eddy taught advertising design at Oakland Community College and Macomb County Community College and art history at William Tynedale College in Farmington Hills.

In the last few years, he has taken watercolor workshops with Fred Graf and Tony Couch because he would "like to be more of a fine artist, painting more landscapes, more nature, more rivers and more barns."

"I love watercolor, the way it looks, the looseness of the flowing colors and the freshness," Eddy said.

"Renoir is one of my inspirations, but more importantly, I am an admirer of Monet. Monet's garden

paintings appeal to me, the spontaneity, the impressionist style, the fresh approach to painting the quality of light."

Before he puts a stroke of color on paper, Eddy makes a preliminary black and white sketch.

"I try to capture the way sunlight works on the shapes. I get my values down," Eddy said. "I think there's a basic palette I got attached to back in art school: ultramarine blue, burnt sienna. Now I find myself using cobalt blue and, in the landscapes, lemon yellow."

Short on painting time

Eddy admits he doesn't spend as many hours as he would like to painting. Instead, he spends mornings working to develop compositions for paintings. Light and design, he stresses, are important ingredients in his paintings, worth sacrificing painting time.

"The subject matter isn't that important. It's the approach," Eddy said.

While working for Campbell Ewald, he ran Gordon Eddy Graphic Design on the side, creating brochures and logos for local businesses. Six years ago, he changed the name to Plymouth Art Studio.

"I have a value sketch of a little white water stream up north that I'm going to paint next," Eddy said.

"I'm putting what I see in my paintings. The beauty of the design and play of the light, it's something that's all around us in nature and I would like to share that."

Visitors to the fair can rest and refresh themselves under the trees in Kellogg Park.

Hours for Art in the Park are: 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday-Sunday. Kellogg Park is at Main Street and Ann Arbor Trail.



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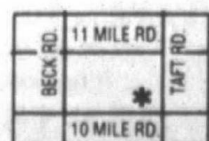
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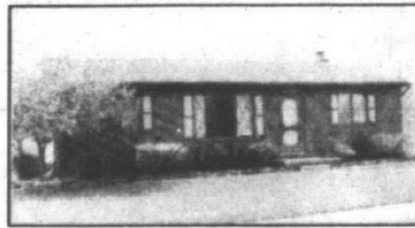
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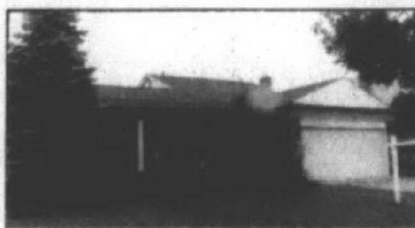


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Luck helps boost new children's novelist

The modest, 48-year-old West Bloomfield author's "dumb luck," however, looks more like a decade's worth of hard work on closer inspection.

Actually, you might even say her efforts go back farther than that — to the time when she was a youngster growing up in Midland, and striving to emulate her mother, the late Georgena Goff, also a writer.

"I've always written," says Tomey. "And when I grew up and got married, I thought that's what mothers did. That's what my mother did every day, even with five kids."

Tomey's fiction-writing career started off with a bang 11 years ago when the first story she ever submitted for publication, a Christmas tale titled "A Very Special Present," was snapped up by Woman's Day magazine and featured in their issue for Christmas week 1981. (Based on the relationship between her son, Paul, and his grandfather, the story was inspired by real-life characters and events, as is much of Tomey's fiction.)

"As far as my writing career goes, that was the best thing that ever happened to me," Tomey said. "And it was also the worst thing. I thought it was all going to be so

easy. Then I didn't sell another story for nine years."

It wasn't because she stopped trying. She enrolled in the MFA program at the University of Michigan and set to work on a mainstream novel. She honed her skills by writing, editing and selling, a number of personal essays and other non-fiction pieces. And she continued to write short fiction, much of it submitted to Woman's Day, all of it returned with rejection slips.

The novel itself, which took several years to complete, met with the same fate.

Then one day about a year-and-a-half ago, a teacher-friend suggested to Tomey that she try her hand at

writing children's literature.

It turned out to be an excellent suggestion.

Tomey, who'd always enjoyed children's literature, but never written any, sat down and began to put together a story about a feisty, 9-year-old redhead named Raydeen Grimley, whose life is opened when her grandmother dies and her grandfather comes to live with Raydeen and her family. Tomey modeled the character of the grandfather very closely on her own father she says, and his reaction to her mother's death several years earlier.

Before she had completed "Grandfather's Day," an idea for a second story was already simmering. It would be a slightly less serious tale than "Grandfather's Day" but "Neptune Princess" would again center around a mischievous redhead. ("I have a sister who's a redhead," says Tomey.)

The athletic adolescent, Poppy Field, who early in the story suffers a broken leg, would very much resemble Tomey's real-life daughter, Kristin (now 23).

A secondary character, Cootie, would be based on a former neighbor, who Tomey remembers as "a true eccentric." Tomey would even include bits and pieces of herself and her own mother as she created the character of Poppy's mother, a poet. (To understand more about her main character's temporary disability, Tomey hobbled around on a pair of borrowed crutches for several days, interviewed doctors and made friends with a young girl who'd recently broken her leg.)

After finishing the books, she packed them up and, with fingers firmly crossed, sent them off to separate publishers. Although she had no hard-and-fast rules, she says she sent "Neptune Princess" to Brad-

bury Press because it was a division of Macmillan and "they publish a lot of books." On the other hand, she chose to submit "Grandfather's Day" to Boyd's Mills Press because it was small and new and she had read that the publisher was looking for new writers.

Both books sold quickly and, as it happened, within weeks of each other.

"It simply amazed me," says Tomey. "Neptune Princess" was brought out in April. "Grandfather's Day" will be in bookstores this September.

A third book, "Savage Carrot," is expected to be out next year (yes, there's a red-haired heroine again). And Tomey is working to finish up her fourth, a young adult novel she has titled "Dreamland."

All the "dumb luck" continues. Victoria Diaz of Livonia tracks the books and literary industry.

Nearly 1,000 artists and artisans will converge on Ann Arbor Wednesday-Saturday, July 22-25, for the Ann Arbor Art Fairs, one of the largest celebrations of the arts in the country.

Three separate fairs will line the streets of Ann Arbor during the midsummer festival: The Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, the original juried fair; the State Street Area Art Fair and the Michigan Guild of Artists and Artisans Summer Art Fair.

Media include ceramics, drawing, sculpture, photography, metal/jewelry, printmaking, mixed, painting, fiber, glass and wood. Hours are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Wednesday-Friday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday.

Children may do supervised art projects in a booth run by the Ann Arbor Artist Co-op on Church, north of S. University. Hours are 10 a.m. to noon and 2-4 p.m.

The Graceful Arch Stage, featuring live entertainment from dance to music, will be set up at the northwest corner of S. University and E. University. There also will be strolling musicians.

Twenty artist demonstrations in a variety of media will take place throughout the fair.

The Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, on S. University, E. University and Church, is the granddaddy event. The 33rd annual juried fair will boast 197 exhibitors, 63 of

whom are new this year. Artists are expected from 36 states and Canada. Observer & Eccentric area artists taking part are Elizabeth Lurie (ceramics) and Judith (Yvonne) Fitzpatrick (jewelry) of Farmington Hills.

The 25th annual State Street Art Fair, on Maynard, Liberty, Thompson, William and N. University, will feature more than 200 juried booths. Exhibitors will include Cynthia Gaffield (fiber) of Livonia, Robert Mueller (photography) of Rochester, Jonathan Stopper (jewelry) of Rochester and William Thayer (photography) of Redford Township.

Museum docents needed

Cranbrook Academy of Art Museum in Bloomfield Hills is looking for a few more dedicated docents.

Training can be challenging. The pay is nonexistent. But longtime docents say they've been repaid with a better knowledge of 20th century art. Some of them even do it for love.

The museum's current corps of 32 docents meets every Monday morning from September to June to sharpen their knowledge of current and coming exhibitions.

Because of the time and effort the museum's staff puts into training the docents, volunteers are asked to make a two-year commitment to the program. New docents must complete a 16-week survey course conducted on Monday afternoons throughout the fall.

Based on the book, "Design in America — The Cranbrook Vision 1925-1950," the course covers a different medium each week. Beginning docents conduct practice tours and hone their public speaking skills. Graduation includes a tour of 15 objects in the main gallery.

Members must be able to give one- to two-hour tours at least once a week for a minimum of 10 tours a year.

Unlike other museums' programs that require docents to repeat the same lecture throughout their tenure, Cranbrook's volunteers need to be flexible enough to handle changing exhibitions.

Instead of giving a lecture, docents learn to engage tour groups in an ongoing conversation about the exhibit. That means incorporating visitors' opinions into the tour conversation.

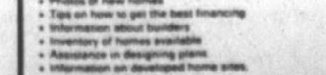
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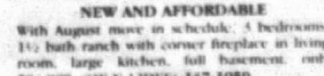
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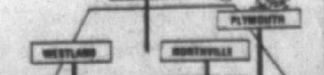
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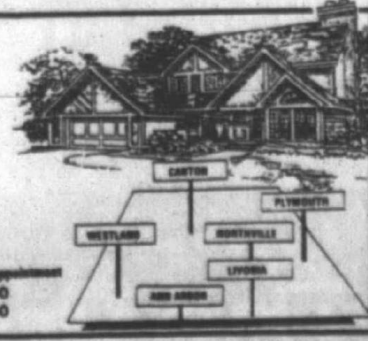
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Lensman captures prairie's beauty

Fascinated by the growth habits of prairie grasses and flowers, Livonia photographer Max Nemazi focuses on their beauty in a 20-piece collection displayed to July 31 in the Livonia City Hall lobby, Farmington Road and Five Mile.

The collection is on loan from Matthaei Botanical Gardens in Ann Arbor.

Nemazi captures the blooms, seed pods and meadows of perennial wildflowers like the Prairie Blazing Star, Goldenrod, Queen of the Prairie, Purple Coneflower, Big Bluestem, Rattlesnake Master and Butterfly Weed complete with butterflies.

Along with Nemazi's work, the July show, presented by the Livonia Arts Commission, features gouache paintings of Packards, Bentleys, Rolls Royces and Thunderbirds by Westland artist Roger Hardnock, a Center for Creative Studies graduate.

Hardnock's artwork publishing credits include Automotive Quarterly, Car Styling, and International Lady (Rolls Royce). He recently exhibited work in a two-person show at Nelson's Gallery in Livonia.

Nemazi, a retired engineer who worked 35 years for General Motors, coordinates the wildflower gardens at Matthaei. He shot many of his first photographs as a youngster with a Kodak box camera.

"I like nature and I like photography," Nemazi said in a telephone interview before embarking on a three-week hiking and biking trip to Alaska in June. "I like the prairie flowers because they're unique unto themselves. Prairies generally don't have trees. It's open land but it's undeveloped."

Early French explorers named the open, treeless, grassy lands of middle North America, prairies. The prairie's ecological system consists of level or slightly rolling grasslands.

Lacking shrubs and trees, the ecosystem is home to plants, insects, birds and animals not found anywhere else. Animals such as prairie chickens, dogs, and squirrels thrive on the prairie's grasses and wildflowers, shying from forests and wetlands.

Prairies have bloomed in late summer for centuries. The purple Kansas coneflower, Echinacea purpurea, was a herb favored by the Plains Indians in illnesses. It's especially popular in Europe. More than 300 published scientific studies illustrate how Echinacea strengthens the immune system.

"The roots of these prairie flowers live for years and years," Nemazi said. "They're perennials if you don't cut or mow or use weed killers."

"Prairie flowers thrive in few

places locally anymore because of development. Today, they are mainly found in Kansas, Nebraska and out West, although many homeowners in California and New York forego lawns for meadows of wildflowers, requiring little care."

Steel Case Corp. in Grand Rapids, instead of a lawn, has a prairie, Nemazi said.

The botanical gardens in Ann Arbor have a restored prairie.

"We do burn ours at Ann Arbor

every so often," Nemazi said. "Prairie flowers like the ashea. Fire helps destroy seeds of the annuals and weeds, while prairie plants can survive."

Since retiring, Nemazi has hiked and biked his way through New Zealand, Australia, Peru and Africa, all the while clicking away.

"I like traveling. I try to get there at the right time so the flower is blooming. Sometimes, I enlarge them and give them to friends,"

Nemazi said.

"Composition is the main thing. Exposure and shutter speed is part of technique. Composition and lighting is critical. If the lighting isn't right, you don't want a flat picture. You change the depth of field so the background is blurred, so your subject stands out."

Nemazi stresses there are lots of rejections in photography. Several rolls of film may produce one or two good pictures.

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"Ceramics of the Picuris Pueblo," an exhibit of works by Anthony Durand, will run July 17 to Aug. 29 at Susanne Hilberry Gallery, 555 S. Woodward, Birmingham.

The opening reception to meet the artist is 4-7 p.m. Friday. Hours are 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Wednesday-Saturday.

The traditional mica-coated pottery of Picuris, situated in the Sangre de Cristo mountain range of northern New Mexico, was first recorded in 1596 shortly after the first Spanish settlements.

Since 1600, this pueblo has been widely known for its beautiful and utilitarian wares.

Although the primary clay source at Picuris has been destroyed by road construction and mining, Durand and his grandmother, Cora, have struggled to keep the Picuris pottery tradition alive on their pueblo.

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Before you call the pros, give house the once-over

You're smitten with an older home, but you want to take a second look to give it a cursory inspection before you call in the professionals.

Here are a few items to look at, according to the pros at HomeMaster of America:

• **Structural:** Look for horizontal and vertical cracking at foundation walls, cracks in house slabs, missing supports, bowing walls. Patching a crack is a minor repair, but it will cost a few thousand dollars to resupport a wall.

• **Roofing:** Many leaks are caused by faulty flashings. Look for excessive roof wear, missing shingles or slates. A bow in the roof may indicate a framing deficiency, particularly if there are more than two layers of roofing.

• **Heating and cooling:** Check operation and heating and cooling effect room by room. As with all mechanical equipment, these systems have an expected life span, which can be extended with proper maintenance.

• **Plumbing:** Look for older gal-

vanized/brass piping (usually dull-silver/bronze in color), poor water pressure and sluggish drains. They all can signal the need for a major replumbing job. Stains or leaks in a ceiling below a bathroom can mean a bad shower pan, or the need for retilling, new fixtures or regrouting.

• **Inadequate electrical service:** Look for 220-volt service and at least 100 amps with a disconnect switch at the panel box.

The accompanying chart offers a guide to life span and repair of housing components.

Boundary relocation permitted

I bought three condominium units at a campground condominium in northern Michigan. The board of directors is telling me that my trailer is too large because it extends beyond the six-foot boundary setback requirements. Is there any way to resolve this problem?

Yes. If your condominium documents expressly permit the relocation of boundaries between adjoining condominium units, then you

may wish to make written request to your board to amend the master deed to relocate your unit boundaries to enlarge the condominium unit to bring you in compliance with the setback restrictions. Typically, campground condominium documents allow for the relocation of boundaries between adjoining units. The Michigan Condominium Act allows for unit boundary relocation by recording an amendment to the master deed, provided the condominium documents expressly permit this, and mortgagee approval

on the affected condominium units is obtained.

City slickers at home on the range

■ Equestrian communities are becoming more popular, but a successful development means building a community around people, not horses.

It is a small development in size, but not in scope. It is a development of traditionally inspired single family and custom homes, of gentle hills and green pastures, of rural life on the edge of urban reach.

And horses, don't forget the horses. Berwyck on the Park and Berwyck Place, which sit a couple of miles south of the Village of Milford, is a private equestrian community developed by the Farmington Hills-based Irvine Group.

This isn't just another project for the company, according to Norm Finkelstein, vice president.

Both he and Paul Levine, Irvine Group president, were looking to develop something "different."

"We had been looking at the Milford area for some time — we liked the tone of the area and hoped to get ahead of the developing pack."

On one of their scouting trips they stumbled on the parcel. Another devel-

oper already had designs on the property, Finkelstein said, but as luck would have it, the plans fell through.

Several months after first seeing the land, the owner called and asked if they were still interested.

They were. "Paul is a longtime horse lover, and I have an appreciation for horses myself," he said. Both have been around horses all of their life, he said, and the property just appealed to them as a special site.

"I could say it was the stables (the property had once been a horse farm), but it was more than that," he said.

"We just looked at each other and said, 'Boy, if we could just . . . and we knew we had something.'"

Although the idea seemed natural, and the project was built partly because it was something they wanted to do, they didn't charge into the project blindly.

The basic home designs were settled after consulting with area Realtors on what types of houses were popular. Getting all the necessary permit approvals took longer than expected because the idea was something new. Several trips were made to other equestrian communities throughout the country.

"There just wasn't anything like it around here," he said.

"We thought we could bring the whole concept down to earth."

Taking shape

After more than three years of work, the development is taking shape. At the heart of the development is the recently renovated historic stables built in 1941, the centerpiece of the Berwyck Saddle Club, said Holly Osborn director of operations for the Saddle Club.

The Saddle Club is the private equestrian facility that Berwyck members are enrolled in upon purchasing a home. Residents board their horses in the stables and can have Saddle Club employees care for the animals.

"We can do as much or as little as the person wants," she said. Fees vary depending on what horse owners want the club to provide.

Osborn said every effort has been made to make the Saddle Club a top-notch facility.

During the renovation, a clubhouse with fitness room, kitchen and dressing rooms were added. An indoor arena is being refurbished for more stables and new indoor and outdoor arenas are being constructed.

Surrounding the development is a bridle path, pastures and a paddock area. The bridle path leads to horse trails in Kensington Metro Park, Osborn said.

The 58 country contemporary homes in Berwyck on the Park are detached single family homes ranging from 1,760 square feet to 2,800 square feet; priced from \$169,000 to \$269,000.

Across Milford Road lies Berwyck Place, a 14-site development of custom houses sized 2,800 square feet and up and starting at \$300,000, she said.

Takes commitment

Elric S. Pinckney Jr., president of ESP & Associates Inc., a Denver, Col., real estate marketing firm specializing in consulting and feasibility studies for equestrian communities, said the number of these developments has grown steadily in the past decade.

Equestrian communities come in varying sizes. Sometimes they are packaged with other amenities like golf, and sometimes they cater to select horse fanciers.

"An awful lot of whether an equestrian community will work depends on the

Management group cited in fair housing complaint

The Fourmidable Group, reputedly one of the largest apartment management firms in southeastern Michigan, has been accused of racial discrimination in its leasing practices.

The Fair Housing Center of Metropolitan Detroit filed the complaint in federal court earlier this month after sending testing teams to 23 of Fourmidable's complexes since August of 1990.

In its filing, the Housing Center, a non-profit monitoring organization, said it found evidence of discrimination in almost half of 73 testing situations.

Fourmidable is headquartered in Farmington Hills.

The complaint alleges civil rights violations and negligent performance of duty. Unspecified punitive monetary damages have been sought from Fourmidable as well as recovery of legal fees.

Douglas Hyman, a lawyer for Fourmidable, declined to comment on specifics of the complaint. But he defended the firm's record.

"Some areas defined as discrimination are so far-fetched, it's unbelievable to me," Hyman said. "This company is in the business of renting apartments and they rent to anyone regardless of color, creed or national origin."

One of Fourmidable's complexes identified in the complaint has a minority population of 92 percent, Hyman said.

"My experience with this company is that its minority occupancy rate substantiates its fair

housing policies," he said.

"This is blown way, way out of proportion. You're going to see a vigorous defense of this matter," Hyman said.

Victoria Roberts, a lawyer representing the Fair Housing Center, sees things a bit differently.

"I believe the testing evidence we have is very compelling," she said. "We're hopeful that if we prove the allegations, Fourmidable will enter an agreement to cease and desist practices."

Fourmidable was targeted due to the number of complaints received by the Fair Housing Center over the years, Roberts said. Several complexes managed by Fourmidable in O&E communities were mentioned in the filing.

A summary of those allegations follows.

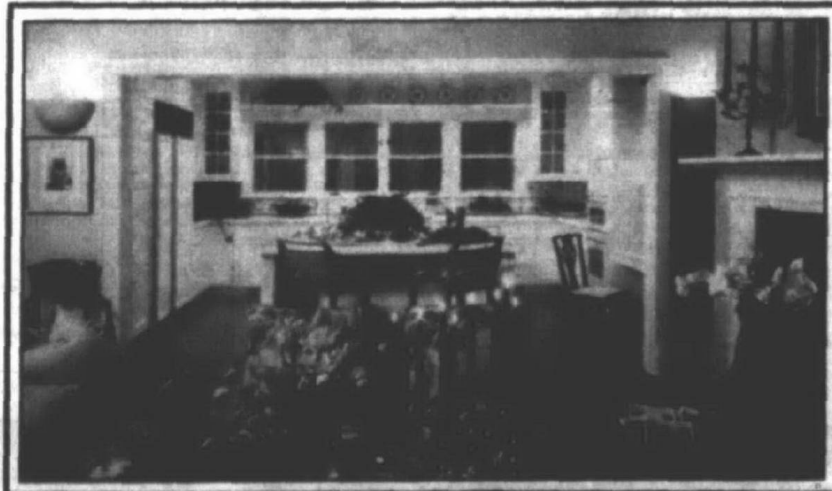
● Great Oaks Apartments, Rochester. A black tester allegedly was informed about only one available unit, while a white tester was informed of several available units a week later.

Also, the white tester received a mailed follow-up card from the rental agent, while the black tester didn't.

● Essex at Hampton, Rochester Hills. A black tester was told that a two-bedroom unit would be available in a week. She was told that there were no models to show and wasn't informed of rent specials.

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Victorian styling, contemporary flair

Victorian accents combine with country styling in the Grandee, a large two-story house inspired by a sketch from a reader.

A covered front porch stretches across the front and wraps around the left side. Clean, simple lines prevail in the railings and dowels, but turned columns and decorative trim at the top add Victorian flavor as do the arched bay windows above, capped by gazebo-like roof lines.

Inside, nine-foot ceilings throughout harken back to the Victorian era. The rest of the house is contemporary. Family room and lobby are vaulted to the second-story ceiling and spanned by a wide balcony that overlooks both rooms. Seven-foot high bookshelves flank the front door and a spacious living room is to the left.

Cooking and eating areas are to the right where choices include a formal dining room, a sunny nook or an extra-long eating bar. The walk-in pantry that separates the kitchen from the dining room has cupboard doors that allow direct

kitchen access to some of the shelves.

A large utility room with deep sink and pull-down ironing board is just steps away from the kitchen and adjacent to the garage too.

The octagonal-shaped family room features a fireplace with tiled hearth and French doors that open onto a split level deck.

The swing room is a multi-purpose space that could be used as guest quarters, a home office or hobby room. French doors open onto a private deck.

Large enough to include a sitting area, this space serves as an adult retreat from the activities in the rest of the house. The bedroom has a raised spa, enclosed lavatory and shower, and twin basins. An additional vanity is just outside the walk-in closet.

equestrian facilities," Pinckney said. "It's a disaster when the community isn't planned well."

The biggest mistake developers make when building an equestrian community is to "over-horse it."

"Everything is horse, horse, horse," Pinckney said. Equestrian communities succeed because they treat projects as developments that incorporate horses, not as stables that incorporate houses.

Pinckney said he has found equestrian communities attract a wide variety of people — a majority, in fact, are not even what one might consider horse people.

"Typically, slightly less than 20 percent of residents will have a hands-on interest in horses," he

said. "A lot of people are just attracted to the ambiance of the horses."

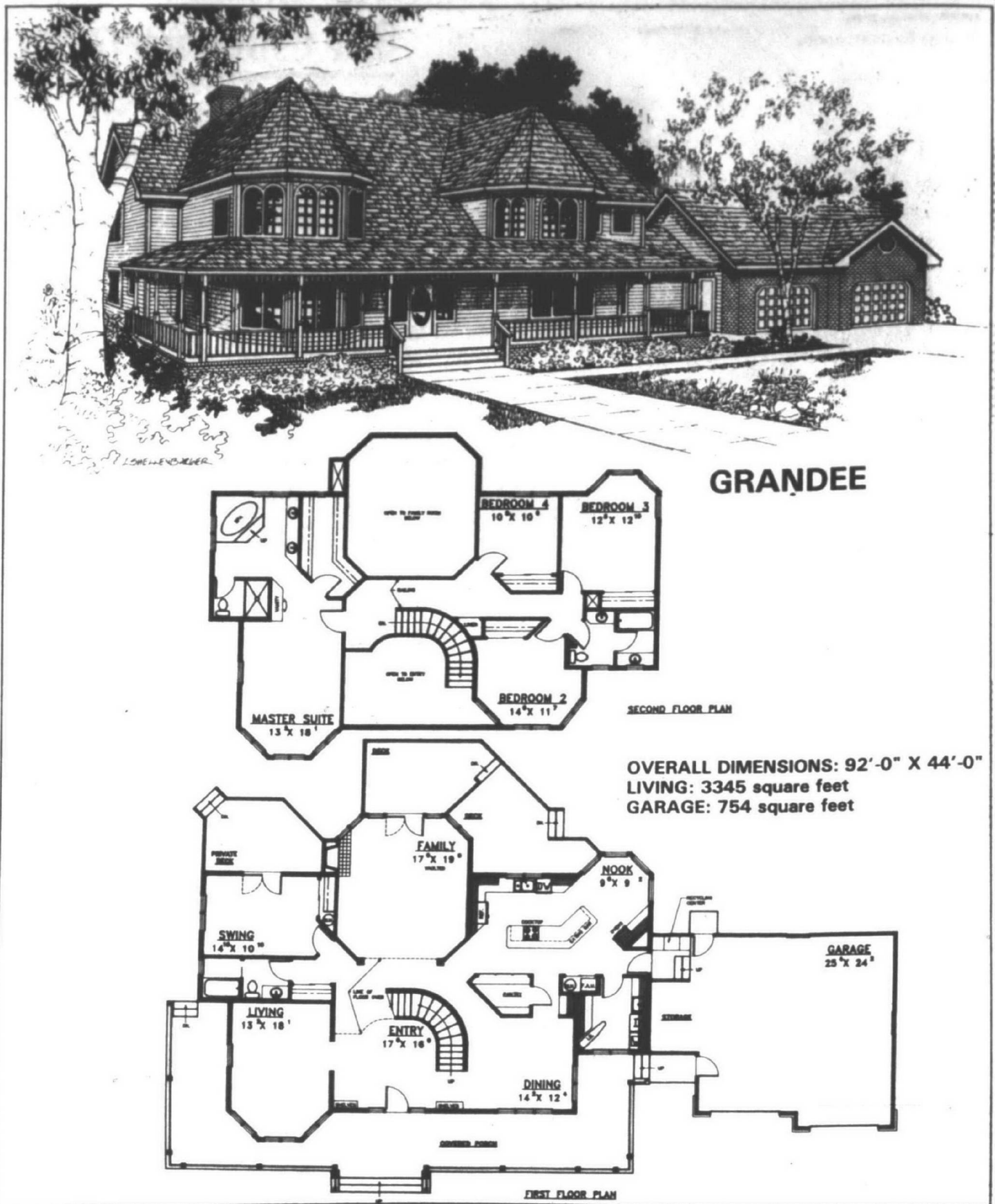
"These people may want to see a horse trotting by the back door, but they're not likely to actually ride one," he said.

Pinckney said he could not stress enough that a developer who views an equestrian development as a sales gimmick will not be successful.

"I would say that probably 90 percent of the time, when I look at a planned equestrian community, I recommend (the developer) not do it," he said.

While equestrian communities typically sell well, other types of developments sell as well or better for developers, he said.

"A lot of developers think they can hang up a shingle, slap up a barn and call it equestrian," he said. "(An equestrian community) takes a real commitment on the part of the developer."

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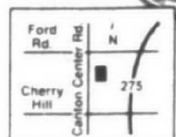
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American scores hat trick

• Buckingham Square, Troy. A white tester was informed of an immediately available unit. The very next day, a black tester was told that

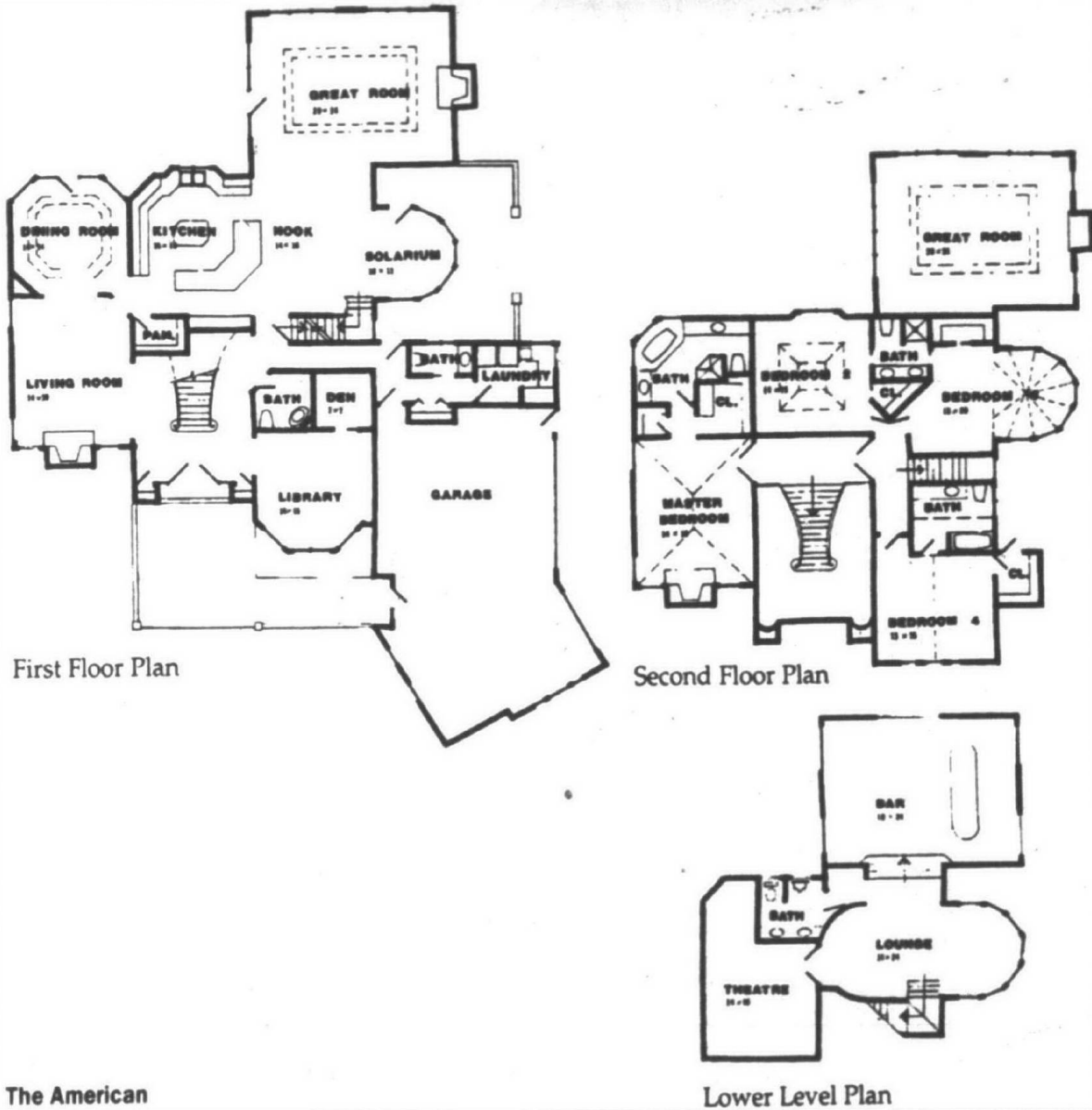
four people were on a waiting list.

Lower Level Plan

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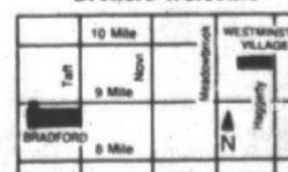

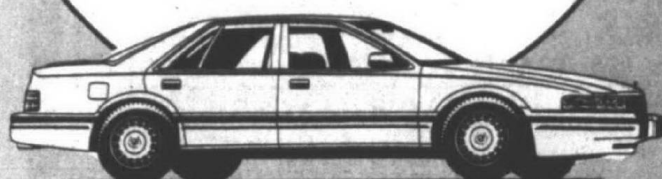
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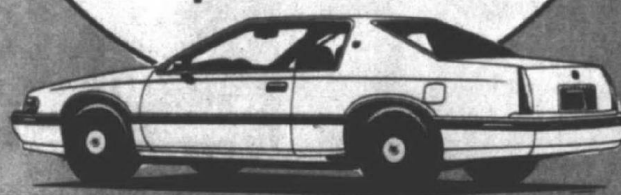
