Good turnout predicted



A hotly contested race for Plymouth Township supervisor that pits four Republicans against each other is expected to draw voters to the polls. The race and those for trustee and clerk will determine who runs the township for the next four years.

Those Republicans are ready to rumble.

A good turnout is predicted when voters in Plymouth Township go to the polls Tuesday to choose the Republican candidate likely to be the next Plymouth Township supervisor.

The candidates are Stephen Boak, Kathleen Keen-McCarthy, Charles

McIlhargey or John Stewart.

The winner of the Republican primary is traditionally the winner in the general election in the heavily Republican township. The winner faces independent Ronald Edwards in November.

Voters will also choose four trustees from a field of seven, a new clerk and a treasurer.

The battle lines have been drawn with incumbents and party regulars facing off against challengers.

The incumbents point to the township's successes in planning good devel-

opment and stemming rising taxes. The challengers point to Western Townships Utilities Authorities project contracts that were let without bidding, and say the township leadership needs shaking up.

In both the city and township, voters will decide whether to return Georgina Goss to the state House, or opt for Plymouth city commissioner Jerry Vorva or other challengers Ronald Ambrose and Robert Bernard.

Prehistoric find

Canton man helps unearth fossil

After Canton geologist Dave Thomas heard that Harry Brennan found mastodon bones on his virgin acreage west of Saline last January, he couldn't wait to volunteer his services to Brennan and the University of Michigan paleontologist excavating at the site.

Dr. Daniel Fisher — professor of geological science at U-M and curator of the university's Museum of Paleontology — was only too happy to have Thomas' help.

As Fisher, Brennan, Thomas and a team of volunteer archeologists and

paleontologists uncovered the bones of the extinct, massive animal reminiscent of an African elephant, it became clear that more than just 11,000-year-old bones and teeth were present.

"Elephant prints aren't always that distinctive, because the foot is just a big round pad," said Fisher. "If you just saw just one, you would be hard-pressed to say what it was. But when we saw a pattern, we said this has to be a trailway. Once we had three or four, it was pretty clear."

Township urges against land sales

Like Canton Township, Plymouth Township is urging the school district not to sell selected surplus land to developers. Township officials and residents would like to see certain sites preserved as open space and for recreational use.

Plymouth Township officials, concerned about a partially wooded 17-acre site adjoining Plymouth Township

Park that's up for sale, hope they're more successful than Canton was recently.

Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack requested that the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools sell to the township a parcel adjoining Field Elementary School so that it could be preserved as open space for nearby residents.

The township offered the school district what it originally paid for the site, plus an adjustment for inflation. That

offer was turned down, and Canton officials have determined that paying the full market value of roughly \$1.2 million isn't feasible.

The school district is entertaining an offer from The Selective Group, Inc. to purchase the 17 acres for \$850,000. The Farmington Hills developer would like to build single family homes on at least 37 lots, and to close the deal within 30 days.

Deferred taxes

Plymouth Township taxpayers should know that a deferment of summer taxes is available for taxpayers deemed eligible by the state, said township treasurer Mary Brooks.

By state law, taxpayers who can apply to delay paying their summer taxes include those 62 or older or the un-remarried surviving spouse of a person 62 or older at time of death, paraplegics or quadriplegics, servicemen or servicewomen or eligible veterans or widows, the blind, and the totally and permanently disabled.

Pols take parting shots

It's time to take those last shots at political opponents, as time runs out before Tuesday's election.

Last week, some candidates vying in the Republican primary for elected Plymouth Township and county office and their supporters took turns trading charges:

• Township supervisor Gerald Law obtained local district court transcripts which show supervisor candidate John Stewart, a township trustee, represented a client against the township.

Stewart said he was in court representing a man's son — also in court — when he was asked to appear on behalf of the father in a violation of probation hearing. While the court transcript shows Stewart saying "John Stewart appearing on behalf of the defendant," Stewart said his client in essence "spoke for himself. I was never paid for that."

• Stewart said township trustees last year approved a \$40,000 "sweetheart oral contract" supervisor candidate and building director Charles McIlhargey made with a contractor over work done on lighting improvements at the township park. McIlhargey said he's had "nothing whatsoever" to do with improvements at the park, adding those are handled by other township departments.

• Former township trustee Frank Millington — pictured with Kathleen Keen-McCarthy on one of her campaign fliers — charged McIlhargey supporters led by former supervisor and county commissioner Maurice Breen are responsible for the disappearance of Keen-McCarthy signs from around the township. Millington said he's considering offering a \$100-\$200 reward for in-

Township interested

Plymouth Township, which has the right of first refusal, asked the school district for additional time to have the land appraised. "The township board feels strongly that the best and most reasonable use of the property should be to incorporate it into the Township Park complex," said Plymouth Township Supervisor Gerald Law in a letter to the school board.

"The Plymouth Township Board is prepared to work with the school board to see that this happens in a manner that is in the best interest of the taxpayers of Plymouth Township and the Plymouth-Canton School District," said Law.

Jim Anulewicz, director of public services for the township, said a beech climax forest "of equal to, or slightly less, quality than the Miller Woods" covers eight of the 17 acres. "It's fabulous," he said of the woodland, home to immense hardwood trees, hawks, owls and wildflowers. "We could put two soccer fields in there (the open area) and have the woodlot area preserved with some nature trails and a small nature center."

Educational asset

Anulewicz envisions "extensive

use of that site by the schools. Wouldn't it be great to incorporate use of that nature trail into science classes? You could have a controlled, protected area and staff on hand, assuring a worthwhile program."

School board president Roland Thomas says the board is willing to discuss the issue, but doesn't see a need to keep the land as open space.

"There's always merit in continuing discussions and we can probably try to work something out with them," he said. "But we also have an agreement with The Selective Group and will have to take a look at that."

The school board agreed Monday night to allow the township additional time to appraise the property and pursue a purchase.

"Now we have to check with (The Selective Group) to see if they are willing to extend the time line," said Supt. John Hoben. "We are willing to wait and see and go along with their request."

Hoben anticipates a decision within 30 days. "After that, the township will have to make a decision whether to buy," he said.

Thomas said the district "has no real educational need for that property. The board has determined that it is surplus. We owe it to the taxpayers of both Plymouth and Canton to sell that property so that

it can be used by somebody.

"What we hope to do is to take the money we raise and buy additional property in other parts of the community so we have a land bank where we can buy future schools. So money is going to be put back into school sites, or school site improvements," he said.

Yack sees the issue differently. "I think when the school district purchased the parcels for possible school sites, they were basically working on behalf of the public, and all taxpayers in the school district participated in the purchase of the property."

"The fact that they are now seen as vacant parcels or surplus parcels implies that, well, they no longer need them. But maybe the public still would like to have them, but for a different use," Yack said. "And since the public has already paid for the properties once, it seems appropriate for the school district to offer them to the municipalities for what they paid for them, plus an adjustment for inflation, so the original taxpayers could be made whole in terms of dollars they invested to preserve these as school sites."

Yack would like to see a public debate on the issue. "The more opportunities we (the city and townships that make up the school district) have to debate

the issue with school board members, the better, because we are all here to serve the same people. I don't know who said, 'No man is an island,' but that's the way the school board operates. They believe they are an island in a sea of taxpayers," said Yack.

Preservation wanted

Joanne Lamar, president of the Glenview Homeowners' Association, mobilized more than 80 residents to oppose the site's development.

"I'm not an isolationist, that's not the issue," said Lamar, adding that homeowners in neighboring Beacon Hill also oppose the development. Lamar said she was told by a school board member that the district is showing fiscal responsibility by selling the land.

"I understand the schools have financial trouble. But it seems to me that's an issue you take up with the state. I don't think you punish the people in the community. The last thing Plymouth Township needs is a new subdivision."

"The thousands of people in the community would be better served if there were a couple of soccer fields and nature paths, rather than 35 homes. It takes two weeks to put up a house. How long does it take to put up a forest like this?"

Goss outspends Vorva in race

Incumbent state House Rep. Georgina Goss is outspending chief rival Jerry Vorva by more than a 4-to-1 margin, in the race for the newly-created 20th state House District.

According to campaign finance statements, which cover fund-raising and spending through July 19, Goss had spent \$19,122.06 while raising \$18,920.81.

Vorva, a Plymouth city commissioner narrowly defeated by Goss in a special election last August, raised \$6,210.16 and spent \$4,615 by July 19.

Also running in the Republican primary Tuesday for the state House seat are Robert Bernard of Northville and Ron Ambrose of Livonia.

Bernard raised \$600 and spent \$591.88 on campaign literature and postage. Ambrose had a waiver and did not have to file a campaign finance statement, as he raised less than \$1,000, according to the state Bureau of Elections.

Goss' biggest contributor was herself, contributing \$2,600 to the campaign.

Some other top contributors to her campaign are the Michigan Education Association, \$1,275; the Michigan Women's Campaign Fund, \$1,000; the Life Underwriters

political action committee, \$500; state Sen. Robert Geake, \$500; and the Michigan Beer and Wine Wholesalers Association, \$500.

Other contributors included Plymouth-Canton schools superintendent John Hoben, \$125; schools trustee Dean Swartzwelder, \$50; Bloomfield developer Michael Horowitz, \$125; the Michigan Women's Political Caucus, \$150; Michigan Consolidated Gas Co., \$100; Charles McIlhargey, \$100; Browning Ferris Industries, \$200; the Michigan Bell political action committee, \$150; the Michigan Trial Lawyers Association, \$225; U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, \$100; Michigan Farm Bureau, \$250; and Esther Hulsing, \$100.

Expenses include \$400 to rent a campaign office in Old Village, \$505 for campaign signs, around \$3,300 for campaign literature, and \$601.72 for food for a campaign fund-raiser.

Vorva has his own biggest contributor, putting in \$4,675 of his own money. Among other contributors were Jan and Dorothy Muller of Northville, \$500; Plymouth city commissioner Doug Miller, \$100; and Plymouth city commissioner William McAninch, \$50.

Plymouth city commissioner Dennis Shrewsbury, who said he supports Vorva in the race, contributed \$100 to Goss but nothing to Vorva's campaign.

Shrewsbury said he contributed to Goss while attending her local campaign fund-raiser at the Mayflower Hotel. "I wanted to see what was going on," he said, adding, "I support Jerry."

formation on who's tearing down the signs. McIlhargey said he's also had signs vandalized, and does not support taking down other candidates' signs.

Patrick Downes, one of Breen's opponents in the county commission primary, has questioned Breen's integrity for making

money off of a Plymouth Township land sale while Breen was township supervisor (Breen abstained from voting on the item.) Now, Breen supporters say Downes violated the state Campaign Finance Act by using bulk-rate mailing permits borrowed from political supporters to mail campaign literature, rather than getting a permit in his own

name. They charge Downes got a reduced rate and did not report the benefit in his campaign report.

Downes responded that "Miscellaneous expenses covering any cost of my share of the \$75 annual bulk mail permit will be reported" to the state.

And finally, a Plymouth Township police report stated that

Breen's mailbox outside his home on Pinehill was discovered knocked over at about 7 a.m. Wednesday. There were no tire tracks at the scene, and police closed the case for lack of evidence.

In writing the report, the officer did not speculate as to whether politics had anything to do with it.



Nine candidates vie for single appeals judgeship



Election '92

Nine candidates are vying for one seat on the Michigan Court of Appeals 1st District (covers Wayne, Washtenaw, Jackson, Lenawee, Monroe and Livingston counties).

Voters may vote for one in Tuesday's primary. The top two vote-getters will compete in the November general election.

The Michigan Constitution of 1963 provides for a court of appeals. Judges are elected from three districts. The state Legislature may increase the number of judges and alter the districts from which they are elected by amending state law.

A candidate for the court of appeals must be a lawyer, under 70 years of age, a qualified elector and a

resident of the district in which he or she is running. The court of appeals hears civil and criminal cases. Three-judge panels hear cases in Lansing, Detroit, Grand Rapids and Marquette. The panels are rotated to encourage statewide uniformity in rulings.

The decision of a panel of the court of appeals is final except in those cases in which a decision is reviewed by the Supreme Court.

Judges are elected for six-year terms. Salary is set by the state legislature. A judge of the appeals court is now paid \$102,346 per year and is provided with an automobile. They also are eligible for health care benefits and a state retirement plan.

What follows is a response to an Observer Newspapers questionnaire from eight of the nine candidates. Candidate Martin Maher did not respond.

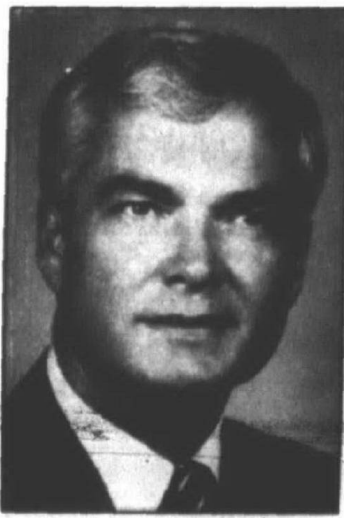

1. What do you think of the Michigan Court of Appeals opinion in the vehicle checklane case?

The Court of Appeals held even though sobriety check points do not violate the 4th and 14th amendment of the U.S. Constitution, such indiscriminate stops do violate Article 1, Section 11 of the Michigan Constitution which may provide greater rights for individuals than the Federal Constitution if a compelling reason exists when reviewing similar Federal and State constitutional provisions and comparing them for textual differences, constitutional construction and historical background.

The Court of Appeals found that checklanes violated the balancing test under 4th Amendment analysis. The United States Supreme Court reversed.

A second decision again voted to strike down checklanes, this time on the basis of the "search and seizure provision" of the state Constitution. This is surprising — and

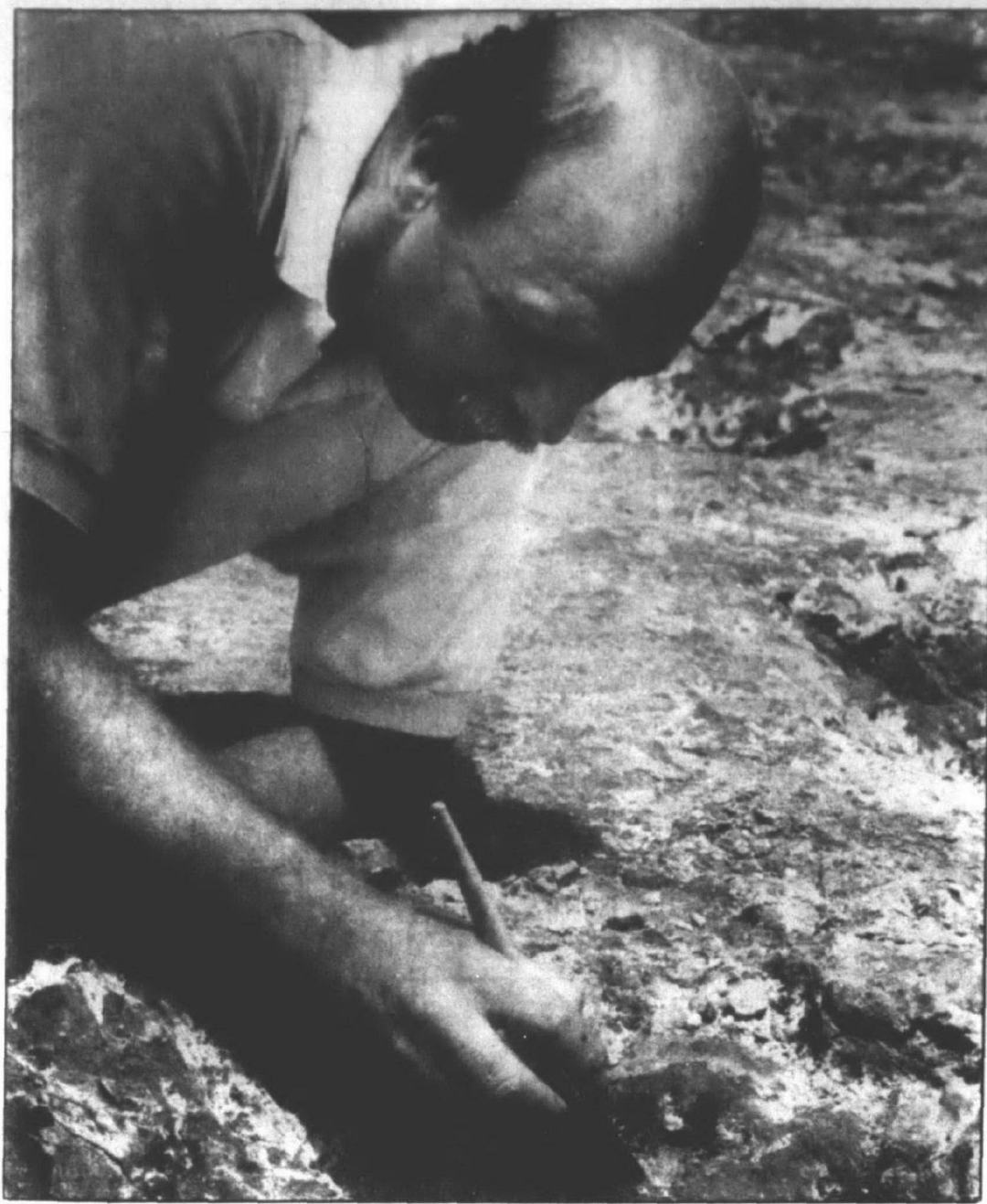

String of prints

To say the team was excited to find a string of more than 20 footprints doesn't begin to describe the emotions they felt.

"To my knowledge, this is the only trackway of a mastodon that has been found," said Fisher. The discovery, said Fisher, will shed light on the biology and physiology of the mastodon. By studying the animal's five-foot tusks — which like tree trunks grown in rungs — "we will be able to figure out whether they were suffering the effects of a diminished food supply," he said.

Fisher said it's interesting to see "this is a single set of footprints. We have suspected before that mature males were solitary in their habits."

By measuring the mastodon's massive footprints in what was once a pond and now is a low-lying area in Brennan's 70-acre Saline Super Soil business, Fisher determined that the animal was a full-grown male weighing five-to-six tons. He probably measured nine feet in height at the shoulder, and 12-15 feet in length.

Thus far, bones representing 60-70 percent of an entire mastodon, presumably a different animal than the one that made the prints, have been uncovered. Among them are a 46-inch-long femur, or thigh bone, that weighs 35 pounds.

A 23-inch-long thoracic vertebra weighs four pounds. An upper molar, still attached to part of the jaw, is about six inches long and weighs five pounds.

More to be learned

Fisher said it's possible more may be gleaned about why mastodons suddenly became extinct at the end of the last Great Ice Age.

"These footprints won't in and of themselves tell us why they became extinct, but in various ways they will

help us," he said.

Experts theorize that mastodons were unable to deal with stresses associated with the climate change at the end of the Ice Age. Another theory holds that climatic changes caused differences in vegetation and plantlife, which were the mastodon's food source. A third theory suggests mastodons were killed off by human hunters, predecessors of Native Americans and the first inhabitants of North America.

Thomas, a geology professor at Washtenaw Community College, worked in 1985 at a mastodon site in Brandon Township in Oakland County, so this wasn't completely new.

"This has been exciting in the sense that you can come and dig bones," said Thomas, who brought his students to the dig to help out. "But to discover these footprints makes it even more thrilling. This trackway is the first in the world.

"We hear so much negative about education," he added. "What's nice is getting schools and other educators to learn about current research in our own state."

Students helped

A job Thomas's students helped with involved making a plastic mold of the footprints for a display at U-M. Brennan is donating the mastodon bones, which also will be on exhibit at the university.

"They're going to call it Brennan's Mastodon," said Brennan, who thought he'd found a dinosaur the day he dug up the first bones, a pelvis and a jaw bone. "It will always be at the university for my great-, great-, great-grandchildren to see."

Initial plans call for the prints to be covered up to protect them from erosion and weather. Fisher expects to work at the site for several more months.

"We will do some exploration for other mastodons at this site. It might be worth a try," he said.

Bicyclist rides over Honda in city's central parking lot

Township clerk Esther Hulsing said that requests for absentee ballots are running twice as high as 1988.

"I think there's going to be a relatively high turnout for this election," Hulsing said.

Pulling no punches

Verbal blows fly in county sheriff's race

Kevin Kelley might have thought he was in a street fight at Central Michigan University 14 years ago, but it's nothing compared with the street fight this year's Wayne County Sheriff's primary has been.

Kelley, incumbent Sheriff Robert Ficano and county Executive Edward McNamara issued a flurry of verbal punches and counter-punches in the closing days of the hotly contested campaign.

The action included Kelley's acknowledgement he had been arrested and booked on a charge of resisting arrest, later changed to assault and battery, as CMU student in September 1978.

Kelley who called the incident "a matter of public record known to my family and friends", also

acknowledged "accidentally striking" a police officer who attempted to break up a fight between himself and another student.

Kelley said the officer had grabbed him from behind in what he terms a "melee".

"It was a serious incident," said Kelley, who blamed it on "a bit of a temper" he's since overcome.

Records show Kelley was placed on six months' probation, including attending a substance abuse program, and was discharged from probation in May 1979.

An Isabella County court spokeswoman declined comment on the case Friday, but acknowledged it has been the subject of intense media interest.

McNamara, who appeared beside Kelley at a hastily-called

press conference Friday afternoon, issued a verbal blow his his own — issuing memos allegedly written by the sheriff purporting to show Ficano sought to use sheriff's personnel to investigate McNamara's financial holdings while the two men vied for the county executive's nomination in 1986.

"I'm clean, nothing came of it," McNamara said. The executive said he believes the alleged investigation centered on the Will-O-Mac Corp., owners of the Northville-based Oasis driving range, in which McNamara is a partner.

Don Cox, president of the sheriff's deputies union said his organization continues its support of Kelley.

"Our 1,100 deputies stand 100 percent behind Kevin Kelley," Cox said, adding Kelley had told

him of the 1978 incident before the story broke.

"He told me he'd made a mistake 20 years ago," Cox said.

Ficano was unavailable for comment on McNamara's allegations, but has previously said he considers the executive the driving force behind Kelley's campaign.

The campaign has been marked by negative advertising. Kelley ridiculed Ficano as a parade-loving showboat in one spot. Ficano countered with ads featuring a spokesman who likened Kelley's campaign tactics to those of ex-Ku Klux Klan leader David Duke.

Tuesday's Democratic Party primary is tantamount to election. A third Democrat, Charles Nemeth of Dearborn is also on the ballot.

No ticket-splitting in Tuesday primary

Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on election day, Tuesday, Aug. 4. Voters are reminded that they may vote in only one party primary. Voters may not split tickets in a primary. To do so will spoil the ballot. For example, those who wish to vote in a local Republican or state House race, may not vote in a Dem-

ocratic primary for county sheriff or county commission.

All voters may cast ballots in non-partisan races for various courts and the Wayne County millage proposal. If you have questions, call your local clerk's office before election day.

December trial set for rape suspect

David Buhnerkemper, a 35-year-old drifter charged with five counts of first-degree criminal sexual conduct and one count of armed robbery, will stand trial Dec. 7 in Detroit Recorder's Court.

Buhnerkemper, who is being held on \$100,000 bond in Washtenaw County Jail, is accused of raping and threatening to kill two women in separate incidents in Canton's Knollwood Cemetery. He was bound over for trial Feb. 28 in 35th District Court by Judge John MacDonald.

The case going to trial Dec. 7 involves a 39-year-old Taylor woman. The woman testified at Buhnerkemper's preliminary exam that she was walking home on Telegraph near Van Born at about 9:30 p.m. Jan. 25, 1989. She had just gotten out of a male friend's car which had run out of gas.

The woman said she was upset because she'd been arguing with her friend.

She said she accepted a ride home from a motorist whom she identified as Buhnerkemper.

She said the man refused to let her out of the car until they were at a cemetery. He told her she would be killed, cut up and buried in the cemetery.

The victim testified she was beaten after refusing to comply with the man's sexual demands.

She said she was struck numerous times, and raped several times after he removed her clothing. The victim said the man tried to gouge her eyes out and bit her on the face.

Buhnerkemper will stand trial at a later date for the rape of a 40-year-old Inkster woman. That woman testified at the exam that the suspect robbed her, raped her and threatened her life.

Buhnerkemper was arrested Feb. 12 at his brother's house on Koppnick Road by Michigan State police. Officers said he was tracked down with the help of a woman who said she was raped repeatedly that day in Superior Township in Washtenaw County.

Police in Washtenaw County and Pontiac are looking at Buhnerkemper as a suspect in four sexual assaults. Police are asking any victims who may not have reported a rape to contact them.

Roach's 'Lane' is his life

It has taken Archie Roach a long time to come to grips with his life. But he has in the understated collection of songs on his "Charcoal Lane" LP. Through his recordings, he has found he was not the only Aborigine child taken from his parents at the age of 3.

Through a collection of understated folk and country styled songs, Archie Roach has made a definitive statement about sorrow and anger and the power of music to heal those festering emotions.

More so, Roach's "Charcoal Lane" LP is a harrowing story of a person's life torn asunder: Taken away from his Aboriginal family at 3 and passed around to several foster homes during his youth in an overall attempt to meld his people into the white Australia way of life. At 14, a long-lost sister writes to tell him his natural mother has died.

Older, he's left to grapple with his own lack of identity. Unanswered questions ulcerate into rage and self-destruction.

Along this ruinous path, he lives destitute on the streets, he drinks and fights.

"I couldn't talk to people about things — not even my wife," said Roach, 37, whose 1990 album is an autobiographical sketch. "My uncle knew I played guitar and I had written some songs. He told me to go home and write about my experiences."

The result is "Charcoal Lane," which has been hailed in Australia for its call for human rights and bringing a heightened awareness to the Aborigine cause.

Stripped away of the pain, though, there's an underpinning of hope in songs such as "Took the Children Away" that gives the LP a universal appeal.

In a resonant, heartfelt voice Roach tells the ordeal of what he and several Aborigine children encountered in a chilling government sponsored assimilation program

that lasted until 1964.

The song concludes with the lyric, "One sweet day all the children came back/... Back where their hearts grow strong/Back where they all belong."

The plaintive folk song received an Australian Human Rights award, but it is testament of Roach's attempt to come to terms with what has happened to him.

"At first, I thought it was myself and a few other people that it had happened to and it was an isolated incident," said Roach, who is married and is, ironically, a foster parent to several children. "A lot of people have been coming up to me and telling me how it happened to them. People as old as my grandparents were taken away from their families as children."

"It shocked me... I didn't realize this was happening until I started singing the songs on this album. Nobody ever talked about it before."

They are now. So, too, are people

discovering Roach's bountiful musical talents. He's quick to clarify he's not an Aborigine singer/songwriter but a singer/songwriter who is an Aborigine.

Citing people like Jimmie Dale Gilmore and Hank Williams as inspirations, Roach has always been enamored with the country artist's ability to tell a poignant story in a song. He played in a country type band for awhile, performing cover songs before venturing out on his own.

He expresses a familiar country refrain in "Charcoal Lane," a number depicting his own battle with alcoholism ("And we'd stagger home, all alone/And the next day we'd do it again/Have a revival in Charcoal Lane.")

Homelessness is aptly captured in the singular observation "Down City streets I would roam, used my fingers as a comb" in the number "Down City Streets," which was written by his wife Ruby Taylor.

"I think he's got a tremendously

soulful voice that bridges between the black and white type of voice...," said Dave Brogren of Birmingham, who promotes folk performances as part of the La Casa Folk Music Series. "There's not a lot of performers who can do that nowadays."

In Roach's voice is hurt, the kind of pain that finds itself only to be released through music. There's also that sense of being lost in things that can never be explained. But it's in his music, ironically, where Roach has finally found himself.

"In our culture, singing is healing," he said. "We believe the earth is created through singing."

"People are becoming more aware. There's hope. The children are coming back."

Sonic Youth does it again with 'Dirty'

Lulled into a false sense of secur-

"Dirty," Sonic Youth: Fiends, these Sonic Youth people. They lure you unsuspectingly into dark corners under the pretense of bassist Kim Gordon's seductively sardonic vocals or serenading sound

ity, Sonic Youth proceed to bludgeon the ear with a dissonant, pounding aural assault to leave one coiled in the fetal position. But you love every minute of it.

"Dirty" is about drone, feedback and other majestic manipulations of sound but its also speaks to such topical subjects as sexual harassment in the workplace ("Swimsuit Issue"), despair on the street ("100%" and "On the Strip") and teen angst ("Youth Against Fascism") in a cogent manner.

As with their previous releases "Daydream Nation" and "Goo" (not to mention the "Whitey Al-

bum" under the name Ciccone Youth), caustic sarcasm festers throughout this 15-song, 59-minute urban cacophony. Their obsession with the obsessive — be it with pop icons such as Marilyn Monroe in "Sugar Kane" or primal lust in "Wish Fulfillment" — makes Sonic Youth sound like willful voyagers to life's seediest scenery.

But it's when these often disdainful images are unceremoniously framed by a continual edgy and mesmerizing sound that makes us listen, and thus, and continues to make Sonic Youth a great band.

"Psycholum," Falling Joys: After a rather lackluster opening with a pair of turgid, guitar-blasted numbers, the Falling Joys quickly recoup and further enhance their reputation as one of Australia's finer new musical exports.

Songs on the band's second album range from grand musical statements to delicate, introspective pieces. Vocalist Suzie Higgin captivates, using breathless harmonies to entice while evoking a hybrid sense of melancholy that seems to be rooted in many of her songs. ("If nothing's ventured/there's nothing to write about"—"Ending or Beginning")

But a moody pop diva? Hardly.

"A Winter's Tale" perhaps offers the best showcase for Higgin's vocal capabilities, exalting a joyful story of love in full bloom.

The guitar-invoked splendor of songs such as "Psycholum" is in-

toxicating. Starting out on a primitive, electric charge, the number explodes into a rapture of shimmering guitar fragments. Brilliant, and certainly one of the high points of the 12-song release.

"Sleep," Antenna: Sad, but true, the Blake Babies are no more. The three members have wasted little time in mourning. Instead, vocalist Juliana Hatfield has promptly released her stunning debut album, "Hey Babe" and John Strohm has went about assembling his new outfit, Antenna.

On this four-song CD release, featuring former Blake drummer Freda Love on one cut, "All I Need," Strohm aptly rekindles many of the taut guitar pop pieces that the Blake Babies cultivated in their short, storied career. As a vocalist, though, Strohm only manages to meander along.

"Blow Up," Deep Jimi and the Zep Creams: Eschewing such things as melody and lyrical purpose, this New York-based hard rock conglomeration of guys named Sigi, Thor, Bjorn and Julius plunder and pander to the primal urges in all of us on this four-song CD recorded live at CBGB's. The highlight is a protracted blues guitar number, "Waiting for My Time." Though "Live at Leeds" this isn't.

'Buffy' cleverly blends vampires with Valley Girls

The no-brain antics of Wayne and Garth, stars of the mega-hit "Wayne's World," make a film like "Buffy the Vampire Slayer" possible. If they're reviewing the film, they'd find the story and its nubile young star totally excellent.

And in many ways I'd have to agree. The self-consciously campy blend of "Valley Girl" meets "Lost Boys" hits the right vein with audiences who just want to have fun at a summer movie.

As the movie opens, Buffy (Kristy Swanson) spends her life with friends at the mall. Her ambitions consist of graduating from high school, marrying actor Christian Slater, and becoming a "buyer," primarily because she likes the job title.

"Like why do I have to know where El Salvador is," she complains to her equally vacuous friends after a bad test grade. "As if I'm ever going to Spain anyway."

The movie is packed with dumb-blonde jokes like this, but it also has respect for its lead character, who reluctantly heeds her calling as vampire slayer when mentor Donald Sutherland comes on the scene.

Director Fran Rubel Kuzui brings the horror film full circle. She doesn't feel compelled to heap on the blood and guts and teenage sex. It's like one of those 1960s horror movies, done incredibly tongue-in-cheek, where respected actors appear in cameos as a lark.

Aside from Sutherland, dressed in a baggy brown suit that has followed him from the Dark Ages to what the movie calls "The Lite Ages," there are also star turns by Rutger Hauer and Paul Reubens as the vampire king and his henchman.

Reubens, now using his real name after PeeWee Herman's forced retirement, is almost unrecognizable with

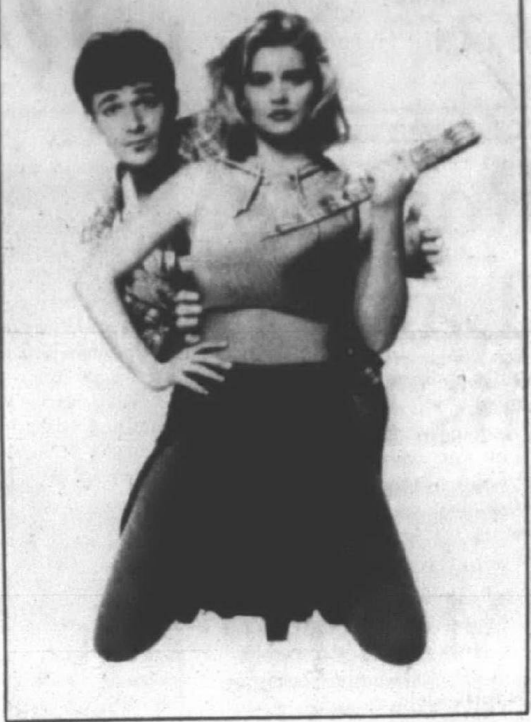
long stringy hair and vampire fangs. This is the kind of role PeeWee would have loved to play — funny and also frightening.

He also delivers one of the movie's goofiest lines, when he sends his band of vampires after a victim who refuses to roll over and die: "Kill him — a lot."

Luke Perry, heartthrob on TV's "90210," is surprisingly likable as Pike, the rebel teenager who joins Buffy's crusade. He doesn't travel the obvious James Dean road, combing his hair very unfashionably onto his forehead.

Though straightforwardly directed, "Buffy" has some unique set pieces, including a scary scene after hours at a float-building factory. Parade creations take on lives of their own as Buffy waits to dispatch her next vampire.

Probably the best thing about "Buffy the Vampire Slayer" is that it doesn't apologize for its silliness. Turn your mind off and you'll have a great time.

After two years as a music journalist, I finally got to go to one of those big deal major label record release parties. And I'm going to tell you what it was like.

As it turned out, my being invited had nothing to do with being a music writer — some friends from Tower Records got the invite and let me tag along. You get your perks when you can.

Driving to the event, the Tower folks told about record parties of the past — the generous spreads of food, hanging out with Iggy Pop, eating lunch with Queen's Brian

May and chatting with David Bowie.

The featured guests at this particular party were not quite as illustrious as that. In fact, I had never heard of them. It was an English outfit who goes by the name of 2 Die 4 (that's "To Die For" in standard English).

The event was held in a sports and bar complex in Mount Clemens. It was one of those places with miniature golf, bungee jumping, go-carts and several bars, in case you overexert yourself playing too many video games.

We went upstairs to the private bar they had rented for the occasion and stood around uncomfortably for a few minutes while we worked out a game plan.

Deciding that eating dinner would be a good thing to do, we

checked out the buffet table and found a generous spread of Cheetos, potato chips and, presumably the main course, cheese and crackers.

Overhead, several video screens were playing 2 Die 4's video over and over again. The video featured the band bungee jumping in some parts of the song and playing their instruments in other parts. It would have been a good introduction to the band except the sound was turned off and what you could hear instead was a DJ loudly playing Bob Seger tunes. To this day, I still have no idea what 2 Die 4 actually sounds like.

While enjoying some Cheetos I glanced around the room looking for someone who might be a musician. No one had the telltale signs of long hair or leather clothing. I did notice that I didn't know anyone. It was

sort of like being at a high school party at somebody else's high school.

Eventually, a record guy came up to us. The stereotype is that record company folks are a strange lot — I believe the slang term for them is "record company weasels." This guy did nothing to dispel the stereotype.

In a misguided attempt to appear "with it" and sexy, he wore a pair of painfully tight-looking bands. He kept slapping the Tower people on the back and was the type of guy who calls everyone "babe."

While talking, he scanned the room for better people to talk to and, eventually, this direct descendant of Herb Tarlick found some — thankfully — and left to "mingle."

Then, the moment we'd been waiting for arrived. The members of

2 Die 4 set themselves up at a table to meet their public. Their public dutifully formed a long line to chat with the guys and get their autographs.

Autograph seekers got a chance to establish deep, personal rapport with the band in the 30 seconds it took to sign "Best Wishes, Fred" or "Love Ya Emily."

The band members broke the conversational ice with questions along the lines of "How ya doing?" Most of the fans were "fine."

Finally, the party broke up. We went and played miniature golf.

The wisdom behind these type of parties is that once you have personal contact with the band, you will follow their career eagerly and give them good word of mouth. Perhaps it's true. If I ever do see their bungee-jumping video on MTV, maybe I will talk up the band, and casually mention my "friendship" with them, showing the photo for evidence.

I hope I won't.

'Masquerade' has a little of everything

PASS THE POPCORN

Mix a rather shy, rather rich girl with a creepy stepfather and a poor but very handsome guy who sails yachts for the wealthy and competitive and you kind of have the basis for the effective little film "Masquerade."

You get a good idea about the characters in their first scenes. As the young woman, Meg Tilly is seen graduating from college and looking longingly at happy families after commencement as she rides off alone in her limousine. The yacht captain, played by Rob Lowe, is

seen working in a race and then having an affair with his boss' bored younger wife.

Naturally, Tilly and Lowe connect. It's a relationship that develops slowly and apparently as a natural progression. Both are good at developing an emotional connection between the pair, if not necessarily a strong physical chemistry.

Also summing in the Hamptons is the woman's stepfather, the most recent of her late mother's string of husbands. Played by John Glover, this guy is the type of obnoxious drunken lout who is the last to leave any party or bar. Due to some inheritance stipulations, Tilly is unable to rid herself of this other legacy from her recently deceased mother. Tilly wants to be rid of him and he'd like her gone, leav-

ing him to inherit millions.

The only truly nice guy around seems to be a clean-scrubbed local cop, played by Doug Savant, who has been carrying a torch for Tilly since they were kids. He tries hard with her but she isn't interested. When she learns he became a police officer and didn't go to law school, she minimizes him completely with a look.

This is a story of the rich and idle, who live in a society where they don't need to lock the doors on their oceanfront 100-room "cottages" and have the local police checking the guest list for admittance into private parties. These are people who give expensive sports cars as birth-

day presents.

It's also about the working people who also live in the town and the different set of standards by which the wealthy live. It's about what people will do when motivated by greed for money or sex or love.

The plot has plenty of twists and some surprises, some romance and not a lot of overt violence. People aren't always what they seem to be and don't always do what is expected. This isn't one of those thrillers that insults your intelligence by giving you a false scare, a moment of relief and then has the killer hop out of the closet. The people that seem to be running the show aren't necessarily in control.

Primary races

Tap these candidates Tuesday

Voters in Plymouth Township will be served up a full plate of candidates on Tuesday's primary ballot.

All township officials are up for election, and since there are no Democrats on the ballot, the Republican primary will settle the matter, barring a write-in campaign.

We have covered the campaigns, interviewed the candidates and made recommendations in various races the last few weeks.

Following is a recap of our endorsements in contested races as voters head to the polls on Tuesday, Aug. 4.

● **Township Supervisor:** **Charles McIlhargy** is in a four-person race for the township's top administrative position which pays \$65,000. His background in business and public service is solid and his experience as Plymouth Township building director adds to his credentials.

● **Clerk:** **Denise Radtke** is making her first venture into elected politics, but is an old hand when it comes to government. She has served as an administrative assistant to U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell since 1977. Her grasp of how governmental units can work together and her community involvement throughout the years will make her an asset to the township board and as an administrator at the township hall.

● **Trustees:** The field is crowded with seven candidates vying for four seats on the township board. **K.C. Mueller, Ron Griffith, Charles Curmi** and **Joseph VanEsley** are the best choices for township board. Mueller, Curmi and VanEsley are all newcomers, while Griffith is an incumbent. The four represent the best of the new and old.

● **State House:** We supported **Jerry Vorva** in his bid for election to the state House last year and we still believe he is the best candidate. He is a breath of fresh air in the political

arena. Goal-oriented and work oriented, Plymouth and Plymouth Township residents can be assured Vorva will fight for them.

The winner of the Republican primary is virtually assured election in November. There is no Democratic challenger.

Wayne County Commission: **Thaddeus McCotter** is energetic, enthusiastic and hard-working. He is the best choice for Republican voters in the 10th District GOP county commission primary.

McCotter, 26, is a Schoolcraft College trustee and has performed capably. McCotter's commitment to public service and personal integrity make him a solid choice for voters on Tuesday.

Integrity has been a key issue in this race because the incumbent, **Maurice Breen**, has been engulfed in controversy surrounding the Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer project and his role in a 1980s land deal.

While he defends his role in both projects, he has been too close to too many controversies for us to feel comfortable about his candidacy.

U.S. House: Six men are competing on the Republican ballot to face Democrat **William D. Ford** and Tisch candidate **Paul Jensen** in the November general election. In the GOP primary, we recommend state Sen. **R. Robert Geake**. Although we disagree with Geake on many issues, including his position on abortion, he is hardworking, conscientious and a man of principle. He is a solid choice for Republican voters on Tuesday.

Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday. Voters should remember there can be no ticket-splitting in the primary. We urge voters to examine the candidates for office and vote on Tuesday.

County, judgeship endorsements

In addition to many local races on Tuesday, voters will select nominees for several Wayne County races, judicial candidates from the non-partisan ballot and decide the fate of a county millage.

We have presented information on the candidates and issues. Here are our recommendations.

● **Clerk:** The winner in November will succeed **James Killeen** who is retiring.

In the Democratic race, we recommend **Ed Wilson**, director of elections for the City of Detroit. He will run an efficient, service-oriented office.

On the Republican side we recommend **Linda Chuhuran**, the former Canton Township clerk.

● **Sheriff:** Incumbent Wayne County sheriff has taken a lot of shots during this year's Democratic Party primary, but we still believe **Robert Ficano** is the best choice.

● **Prosecutor:** Wayne County prosecutor **John O'Hair** is one of the county's most effective and respected elected officials, keeping himself apart from county political infighting. We urge voters to support **John O'Hair**.

● **Circuit Court:** Voters have a solid field of candidates from which to select three judges to the Wayne County Circuit Court. The race is nonpartisan.

We recommend **Denise Page Hood, Jeanne Stempien** and **Robert Ziolkowski**. Voters should also pay attention to **John W. Callahan**.

● **Millage:** Wayne County's poorest residents need help but the proposed 0.5-mill tax increase on the Aug. 4 primary ballot is no solution. Vote no on the tax question.

● **Five candidates** are in the race for Wayne County Probate Court. The top two vote-getters

will compete in the fall.

We recommend **Nancy Diehl** and **Nicholas Tsalis**.

Diehl, an assistant prosecuting attorney in charge of the child abuse unit, has demonstrated how the system can be effective.

She received high marks from her peers in the legal community and will be an effective judge.

Tsalis has experience in all three major areas of probate court activity.

The son of a Greek immigrant, **Tsalis** has strong convictions about the rights of working men and women and their children.

His diverse experience and a commitment to fairness and due process along with his demonstrated record of community service make him a solid choice on Tuesday.

● **Michigan Court of Appeals.** Voters have an impressive field of nine candidates from which to select two who will face off in November. The race is nonpartisan.

We recommend **Cynthia Stephens** and **George Ward**.

Stephens, a Wayne County Circuit judge since 1985, gets high marks from her peers in the areas of scholarship and fairness. She has a wide range of legal and judicial experience.

Ward has 20 years experience in civil law and for the last six years has been chief assistant Wayne County Prosecutor. The reform-minded **Ward** has given much thought to the operation of the court, and we believe can have an impact on the operation of the court.

In this race, votes should also consider **Helene White** and **Edward J. Plawecki**.

White has been a judge for the last 11½ years. **Plawecki** gets high marks for his judicial temperament and his approach to following the law rather than legislating from the bench.

Michigan Court of Appeals opinion in the vehicle checklane case? Comfortable with court's decision. While drunk driving is a major problem calling for vigorous remedies, it was reasonable for the Court to have ruled that a roving roadblock, which produced only one arrest out of 126 citizens stopped, thereby disturbing 125 law-abiding citizens, violated the Michigan Constitution.

2. What is your experience practicing in the court for which you are running?

I am not in private practice. I have been a trial judge for 11½ years, and am familiar with the substance, procedures, and practical realities of the kinds of cases coming before the Court of Appeals. I have handled a large number of appeals from district courts and administrative agencies.

3. Do you consider yourself a strict constructionist or a judicial activist?

Neither. Judicial activists inject personal/political agendas into decisional process to change law notwithstanding framers' intent. Strict constructionists adhere to rigid literal construction elevating form over substance.

Proper balance: Recognize that framers intended/expected judicial interpretation/extrapolation; process should be guided by framers' intent, not judge's personal social policy views.

probably will not stand — because the Michigan Supreme Court has previously held that the scope and reach of the state's "search and seizure clause" is no different from that of the federal constitution.

2. What is your experience practicing in the court for which you are running?

I have won cases in appellate courts from the Michigan Supreme Court to the 10th Circuit in Denver to the Tax Court of the United States. I would estimate I have handled 50-60 cases in the Court of Appeals over the years.

3. Do you consider yourself a strict constructionist or a judicial activist?

I do not believe "strict constructionist" and "judicial activist" are the only two alternatives.

I believe the principles arising from the text of the constitution have to be applied to new circumstances, but I do not believe that judges should be so "activist" that their rulings are little more than substitution of their preferred outcomes for those democratically enacted by the Legislature.

There is a sense in which I do consider myself an "activist." I believe our appellate judges should work both harder and smarter. Despite being backlogged, the Court of Appeals still takes summers off from hearing cases, still encourages frivolous appeals, and still refuses to use differentiated case management techniques. In insisting on those administrative reforms, I'd be most activist.

3. Do you consider yourself a strict constructionist or a judicial activist?

Constructionist. An appellate judge's responsibility is to apply/interpret existing law. The primary purpose of the Court of Appeals is to correct errors of law made by the trial court. Judges should judge, not legislate and thus preserve the separation of power of government, as intended by our nation's founders.

practicing in the court for which you are running?

I have been on the bench since 1982. Prior to that my appellate practice was limited to a few criminal appeals.

3. Do you consider yourself a strict constructionist or a judicial activist?

Neither. I approach each case with a clear understanding that I am bound to resolve disputes efficiently and compassionately based upon the public policy as circulated by the public laws and case precedent of our state.

As a Wayne County Circuit Court Judge for 18 years, I have handled appeals from lower courts and administrative agencies.

3. Do you consider yourself a strict constructionist or a judicial activist?

Labels such as "judicial activist" and "strict constructionist"

are overbroad and can be misleading. A judge's duty is to construe and apply constitutions and statutes, and to follow precedent where applicable. The judicial function should not be substituted for the legislative function. I intend to construe and apply the law in a fair and responsible manner.

5 candidates vie for seat on county probate court

Family values is more than a catchy slogan for candidates running for Wayne County Probate Court — it's the essence of the job.

While probate court handles a variety of topics, including estates and mental competency hearings, the new judge will most likely be assigned to juvenile law.

Five candidates will appear on the primary ballot: Nancy Diehl of Detroit, Cathie Maher of Canton, Robert McClinton of Detroit, Kathrynne O'Grady of Grosse Pointe Park and Nicholas Tsalis of Allen Park.

The top two vote getters will compete in the fall.

Diehl, director of the county prosecutor's child abuse unit, is the perceived front runner, at least to listen to other candidates.

Several candidates have commented on Diehl's lack of experi-

ence before the probate bench.

Diehl, however, points to her record in family law, including co-authoring two nationally-recognized booklets designed to ease the fears of young children about appearing and testifying in court.

"The issues the probate court deals with are the issues I've dealt with," said Diehl, who holds her law degree from Wayne State University.

Among other candidates:

• Maher points to her experience in all three major areas of probate court activity.

"Even if the person appearing before the court is a juvenile, you're dealing with people who need guardians and that can tap into trusts and estates, Maher said. "Mental health care is also an issue."

Maher is married to current probate Judge Martin Maher, who is now running for Michigan Court of

Appeals. A private practitioner with an office in Plymouth, she holds a law degree from the University of Detroit-Mercy.

• McClinton, said he'd practice tough justice on the probate bench.

"A lot of kids come into probate court laughing," McClinton said. "They know they're not going to get much more than a slap on the wrist."

McClinton said he favors work

programs for young offenders. "This will give them vocational skills and could bring them into face-to-face contact with those they've hurt."

• O'Grady also believes the Probate Court has a lack of credibility and a lack of continuing legal education.

A probate judge, she said, has "the potential to be most influential." In her private practice, O'Grady represents indigent minors in

delinquency hearings and abused and neglected children in child protection hearings. She holds her law degree from the Detroit College of Law.

• Tsalis said he believes foster care cases should be assigned to social service agencies on the basis of their particular specialties.

As judge, he said, he would use his "influence" to assure cases were properly assigned. He holds his law

degree from the Detroit College of Law.

Diehl and McClinton earned a "preferred and well qualified" rating from Civic Searchlight — the highest qualification issued by the non-partisan group. The others received an evaluation of "well qualified".

Voters may vote for only one of the five candidates during the Tuesday, Aug. 4 primary.

Bar association rates judicial candidates

The public advisory committee of the Detroit Bar Association has rated judicial candidates for contested elections in Wayne County for the August primary and November election.

The committee, consists entirely of attorneys who practice in Detroit and Wayne County courts.

Ratings are based on an interview and a questionnaire returned by each candidate.

Five candidates received no rating because they did not participate in the process.

Ratings are: outstanding, well qualified, qualified or not qualified.

"A rating refers only to a candidate's qualifications for the position of judge in the court that the candidate is seeking in the election," stressed Barbara J. Rom, co-chair of the public advisory committee, and a partner in the law firm of Pepper, Hamilton & Scheetz.

"The ratings reflect the collective judgment of the attorneys who participated in the rating process and do not refer in any way to a candidate's ability as a practicing attorney," Rom added.

"In the case of a sitting judge seeking election to a higher court, the rating is the committee's opinion of that candidate's ability for the position he or she is seeking," said Rom.

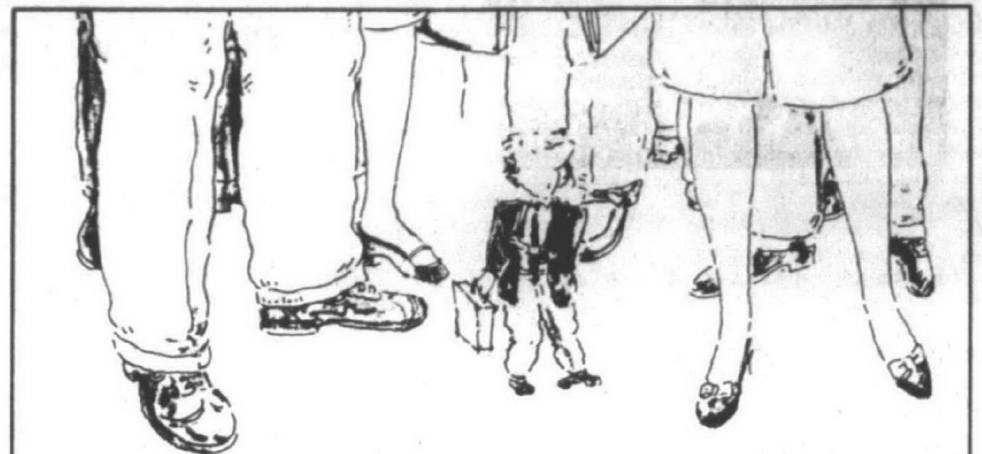

Where you can find your 'Blueberry Hill'

Summers in Michigan mean sun, fun and the arrival of mouthwatering summer sweet fruit and vegetables. Michigan is known for its U-pick farms offering suburban farmers everything from U-pick strawberries and rhubarb in the spring right straight through apples and pumpkins in the late fall. Needless to say, we are a little too late for strawberries and rhubarb and a little too early for apples and pumpkins but this week heralds the start of the National Blueberry festival in gorgeous South Haven, Mich., just a hop, skip and a jump from the Grand Rapids-Muskegon area.

Picking blueberries

Whereas the west side of the state will be picking their hearts out with fresh, mouth-watering blueberries, Observer & Eccentric readers won't have to drive very far because there happens to be one of the best U-pick blueberry farms right in our own backyard. Sandy Acres Blueberry farm, owned and operated by Margaret and Joe Agius in Belleville offers the u-picker over 1,000 blueberry bushes that, weather permitting, should be loaded with sweet, scrumptious blueberries just waiting to be picked. The Agius' have owned and operated Sandy Acres for the past five years. Margaret says "blueberry prices haven't changed a penny in the last five years where a pound of the luscious fruits can be had for only 90 cents."

Sandy Acres is open Tuesday through Sunday (closed Monday) 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. (10 a.m. on Sunday). When I called Friday, the berries weren't quite ripe. Angius said "We need some sunshine." They should be ready sometime this week. Call before you go. They're located at 38093 Judd Road in Belleville just four miles south of I-94. Call (313) 753-9969.

Having never picked fresh blueberries, I questioned the Agius' on the recommended necessities. They suggest that you come comfortably dressed for the weather (by the way, they're closed on rainy days) and wear comfortable shoes. Sandy Acres has tall bushes and "most of the time" you won't even have to bend over to reap their harvest.

It was almost 63 years ago that the blueberry industry began in Michigan. Because the earliest commercial planting of blueberries in Midland, Mich. in 1924 ended in failure, it was believed that Michigan was too cold for the cultivated blueberry.

Due to the persistence of the late Stanley Johnston who believed that the moderate climate and highly acidic soil of the southwestern Michigan shores would be ideal for blueberry production, the blueberry industry has thrived.

Today, there are more than 750 members in seven states and one foreign country who are members of the Michigan Blueberry Growers Association claiming to be the largest producer and marketer of cultivated blueberries in the world.

Storing blueberries

In addition to being available anywhere from u-pick fresh to frozen or canned, fresh blueberries are usually available in most markets from July through September. Look for berries that are ripe, have good bluish-purple color, and be sure to discard any that are bruised or spoiled. Once washed and sorted, blueberries will keep in the refrigerator for up to 10 days.

I prefer to keep mine in a small colander in the crisper drawer for optimum results. Blueberries are best when handled gently as they do have a tendency to smash easily.

They can easily be frozen and kept for year round enjoyment. Simply wash the berries and drain well in a colander. They can be frozen with or without sugar and/or syrup in either plastic freezer type bags or covered food containers.

A pound of blueberries can be frozen in a syrup mixture of three cups sugar to one quart water. Plain blueberries are best for pies and other cooked dishes. Needless to say, they are also delectable in jams and jellies.

Blueberry stains

There aren't a lot of negatives when it comes to blueberries but one that certainly comes to mind is cleaning blueberry stains. On countertops, cutting boards and dishes, Heloise suggests treating the stain with lemon juice and then a light application of baking soda. Rubbing the baking soda gently with the lemon juice will usually do the trick.

When it comes to treating clothes, check first for colorfastness and wash with bleach or a bleach alternative.

If you are hand picking blueberries, it's always recommended that you wear protective gloves but again, the lemon juice and baking soda alternative mentioned above usually will suffice.

CULINARY TEAM goes for the GOLD

Local chefs practice razzle-dazzle culinary techniques to wow the judges at the World Culinary Art Salon in Frankfurt, Germany in October.

The chef painstakingly arranges baby carrots, caramelized pearl onions and spaghetti squash around slices

of cooked pheasant.

Then, with a fine brush, he daubs a glaze of natural juices onto the creation to preserve its glistening appearance.

Welcome to the culinary-arts kitchen at Schoolcraft College in Livonia where the chefs are practicing for the Culinary Olympics.

In early October, teams of chefs and individuals from 32 nations will converge on Frankfurt, Germany for the competition. The event, called World Culinary Art salon, is held every four years, always in Frankfurt.

"We have been practicing for two years, and we have competed several times," said Mario Etemad of Rochester Hills, captain of Michigan's team. "We're ready to go."

Like their athletic counterparts, Culinary Olympians dream of capturing a coveted medal.

"You have to wow the judges," said Jeff Gabriel, 39, head of Schoolcraft's culinary-arts department and a past competitor.

"You have to be a strong, productive chef," said Gabriel of Plymouth, a certified master chef. "Presentation is very important — second to taste."

Etemad, 36, is executive chef at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac. As team captain, Etemad assigns tasks and handles other duties in addition to being a competing chef. He also works closely with team manager Daniel Hugelier, a Schoolcraft culinary-arts instructor and certified master chef.

Contestants must prepare platters of festive cold food, appetizers, full-course luncheons and formal dinners. Food is prepared on-site, using ingredients either brought from home or purchased in Germany.

The team will showcase Michigan specialties, such as morel mushrooms, game meats such as pheasant, trout and dried cherries.

Elaborate desserts will be prepared. Pastry chefs will prepare platters of petit-fours and tea biscuits. Team member

Joseph Decker, an instructor at Schoolcraft College, is scheduled to create a marzipan confection themed to a boy's eighth birthday celebration.

Dishes prepared at the international event will influence food-preparation trends, Gabriel said.

Spearheading Michigan's contingent is Chef de Cuisine, an association of chefs which supports culinary-arts education.

Team members, selected by tryouts and track record, must be able to work under pressure and come up winners. All have won previous awards.

During practice, apprentice Joseph Morin glazed a tray of vegetables under Etemad's watchful eye. Morin, a graduate of the Oakland Community College culinary-arts program, was dressed in a white uniform and wore surgical gloves.

"The food must be flawless," Etemad said.

Winning is "like being being on Cloud Nine," said the team's business

manager, Joseph Beato, 44, owner of Il Centro restaurant in Detroit. "It's a total team effort."

Beato is optimistic. At a recent competition in Chicago — springboard for the Olympics — Michigan's team captured five gold medals, two silver and best of show.

The fund-raising goal has been set at \$80,000 to pay for transportation, supplies and other expenses for the team's two-week stay in Germany.

Several "taste fests" have been held, in which people purchase tickets in order to sample the special foods and meet the participating chefs.

Kitchen Glamor, a local chain of cookware specialty stores, has scheduled two demonstrations during September to benefit the team.

Later, according to Beato, the current crop of contenders will train future competitors.

HONEY-GINGER GRILLED PORK TENDERLOIN

- 2 pork tenderloin, about ¾ lb. each
- 2 Tablespoons fresh ginger, minced

- 1 green chili pepper (jalapeno), seeded & minced
- ½ cup honey
- ¼ cup soy sauce
- 3 Tablespoons sesame oil
- ¼ cup sherry
- 1 Tablespoon garlic, minced
- 1 Tablespoon onion powder

Place pork tenderloin in a heavy plastic bag. Mix all ingredients in a bowl and add to the bag. Seal and refrigerate overnight. Heat grill. Place tenderloin on the grill, baste with the marinade, cook about 6 inches from heat for 8 to 10 minutes, turning and basting with re-

served marinade. (Discard leftover marinade). Do not over cook. Let the loins rest for 5 minutes before carving. Serve with a medley of summer squashes sauteed in olive oil with minced onion, garlic and herbs. Serves about four people.

DEEP DISH BLUEBERRY PIE

- 3 pints blueberries
- 1 ½ cups sugar
- ½ cup flour
- grated rind of 1 orange
- 3 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 cups pre-packaged blueberry mix

Combine blueberries, 1 ½ cups sugar, flour and the orange rind. Toss to mix well. Pour this mixture into a 10 by 6 by 2-inch glass baking dish. Dot the top with butter or margarine. In a separate bowl, combine the biscuit mix with ½ cup sugar, cinnamon and water. Mix well to form a soft dough. Knead a few times on a lightly floured board

until smooth. Roll out the dough (except a ¼ cup) on a lightly floured board into an 11 by 7 oblong. Place crust over the top of the pie plate with a ½ inch overhang. Roll out reserved crust and cut into leaves for decoration. Fasten leaves to top of crust with a little water. Brush the entire top of the pie with just a little milk and sprinkle lightly with sugar. Bake at 425 degrees for 45-50 minutes or until filling is bubbly and crust is golden brown. Makes 8 servings.

HEAVENLY BLUEBERRY PANCAKES

- 4 eggs
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 3 ½ tablespoons all purpose flour
- 2 cups sour cream
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- solid vegetable shortening for greasing the griddle
- 2 cups blueberries, frozen very hard

Combine eggs, salt, baking soda, flour, sour cream and sugar in a bowl and mix well until smooth. Heat a griddle or frypan until hot with just enough solid vegetable shortening to make a very thin film. Drop spoonfuls of the batter to make pancakes. When a few bubbles appear on top of the pancakes, drop a few of the berries into each pancake. Quickly turn and cook the second side briefly. Serve with syrup or powdered sugar. Makes about 2 dozen dollar sized pan-

cakes. The National Blueberry festival is Aug. 7-9 in South Haven, Michigan. Downtown South Haven will be bristling with sidewalk sales, art shows, ice cream socials and an entertainment tent. There will be blueberry pie (of course) eating competitions, carnival at the marina and many more activities all heralding the glorious blueberry. Chicken Caesar salad for two sensational light supper

CHICKEN CAESAR SALAD FOR TWO

- 1 ½ chicken breasts, boneless, char-grilled
- 1 head romaine lettuce (washed and dried)
- 1 clove garlic
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- juice of ½ lemon
- 1 ½ cups seasoned croutons
- 1 cup fresh grated Parmesan
- 1 egg yolk
- generous pinch freshly ground black pepper
- 1 Tablespoon red wine vinegar

1 teaspoon extra virgin olive oil
1 teaspoon Lee & Perrins Worcestershire Sauce
anchovy fillets

Shake enough salt into a large wooden bowl to create a surface for grating. (Salt is not used as a sea-

soning agent in this instance, only as a grating agent). Add one large fresh clove of garlic. Apply pressure to the clove of garlic by pulling the forks across one another at a 45 degree angle. Release all the juices from the clove of garlic and paint the surface of the

bowl with the garlic juice. Remove substantial pieces of the garlic clove. Add four flats of moist anchovy per salad portion and grind into a paste. Squeeze the juice of lemon onto the anchovy paste to further break down the flats. Add the Wor-

cestershire sauce, red wine vinegar, olive oil, and Dijon mustard. Blend well. Generously add finely ground fresh cracked pepper. Add yolk of one coddled egg and blend well. Add 3 oz. grated Parmesan cheese and blend well. Add romaine lettuce and toss until quantity is

evenly covered with dressing. Shake on croutons and additional Parmesan cheese. Toss gently. Serve onto plate and top with anchovy flats and cracked pepper for finishing touch. Skinless and boneless, char-grilled chicken should be arranged atop salad. Serves 2.

Herbs to add flavor to summer-fresh vegetables

AP — This time of year, I like to reap the rewards of my garden by serving fresh vegetables and herbs together. Besides the seasoning, all my summer-fresh vegetables need is a dab of butter.

Should you be lucky enough to grow your own herbs, just run to the garden to pluck a few of your choice. Otherwise, reach for your stockpile of dried herbs and spices.

Whether you're using fresh or dried, you'll taste them more if you

cut them up first. For fresh herbs, first remove the stems, then put the leaves in a measuring cup or custard cup. Holding your kitchen shears upright, snip away until you have the amount you need. For dried herbs, put the herb in the palm of one hand and crush it with your free fingers.

Dried herbs are more concentrated in flavor than fresh. A good rule of thumb is to use one-third as much dried herb as you would use

of the fresh herb. To season enough vegetables for four people, start with one teaspoon of fresh, snipped herb, or ¼ teaspoon of crushed, dried herb. Taste, then add a little more if you prefer a stronger flavor. Here are a few ideas for matching vegetables and seasonings:

Green vegetables: Use basil, dill, nutmeg, oregano, rosemary, tarragon, thyme, Italian seasoning, onion powder or garlic powder.

Yellow vegetables: Try dill, mint, cinnamon, allspice, nutmeg, cloves, ginger, onion powder, pumpkin pie spice or apple pie spice. Potatoes: Reach for tarragon, dill, paprika, caraway seed, nutmeg, chili powder, curry powder, ground red pepper, onion powder or garlic powder.

Start by using one seasoning with vegetables, then create your own combinations, such as: Dynasty Spinach: Stir some sesa-

me oil, sesame seed and garlic powder into cooked spinach. Tex-Mex Corn: Add a little butter, onion powder, chili powder, ground red pepper and cumin to cooked corn kernels. Green Beans Milan: Toss some olive oil, Italian seasoning and instant minced garlic with steamed green beans. Pennsylvania Dutch Tomatoes: Sprinkle sliced fresh tomatoes with cinnamon and sugar.

The students live in Spain and are visiting the Farmington/Birmingham area this summer to study.

They wrote to modify some of the details about Paella, often called the national dish of Spain.

"Paella's family name is Valenciana" which means it is a regional dish from the community of Valencia by the Mediterranean Sea," they wrote. "There are many kinds of Paella — vegetable, oven, seafood, and so forth. None of them contain sausage."

The students wrote that some of

Spain's national dishes more extensively found are "Spanish Omelet" (potato omelet) and Jamon serrano (ham).

"In the spirit of the 500 years since Columbus brought the Spanish language to the Americas, we would like to offer you the recipe for Spanish Omelet for your readers to try and enjoy," they wrote. "It is a hearty meal which serves four hungry people."

SPANISH OMELET

- Five eggs
- six average potatoes

- ½ onion
- pinch of salt
- olive oil

Cut the potatoes into small slices and the onions into small pieces. Fry the potatoes and the onion in an excellent olive oil until the potatoes become a golden color. Beat eggs as for a normal omelet. Add all the ingredients into a big frying pan and fry the ingredients until the mixture hardens but still is soft.

The students, who hail from throughout Spain, added that the schedule for meals in Spain is

breakfast, 7-9 a.m., lunch, 2-3:30 p.m. and dinner, 9-11 p.m.

"Tapas (snack foods which include various bean salads, stewed chicken or rabbit, grilled chunks of mountain ham, meat balls, various hot or cold fish dishes, pickled vegetables, olives, omelets, and pastries) are not served at 6:30 p.m.," they wrote. "You can go for tapas on Saturdays and Sundays during the daytime when we go to certain bars where tapas are served just before lunch. Tapas are also served on Friday and Saturday evenings where one visits bars where the tapas may

substitute for a formal dinner."

Pine Ridge Winery respects French traditions

"The first time I tasted wine was 1967, at a banquet during the pre-Olympic ski trials in Europe," said Pine Ridge's owner and former U.S. ski team member Gary Andrus. "I didn't know anything about wine because I was raised as a Mormon and being a top-flight skier was more important to me than anything else at that time. I was completely amazed that wine was so commonplace at the European dinner table."

Now you know the genesis of Andrus' love affair with wine. Curiosity elevated quickly to the passionate level, and by harvest time, Andrus was in Europe working as a grape picker for several Bordeaux chateaux including the renowned Ducru-Beaucaillou and Lynch-Bages.

Future ski travels took Andrus to Switzerland, the Rhone Valley and Germany where he was fascinated with the steep hillside vineyards. While his romance with wine was growing, Andrus' affection for skiing prevailed. Armed with an MBA, he opened three ski shops in California and became one of the developers of the Copper Mountain ski area in Colorado. Because of the seasonal nature of the ski industry, he spent the summers of 1975, 1976, and 1977 working in several Bordeaux wine cellars.

"My French winemaking experience taught me that you have to respect traditions," Andrus said. "All the tastings proved to me that to have consistency from vintage to vintage, it's vitally necessary to control the source of grapes. That's the greatest fault in California today. Many wineries do not have consistent grape sources to allow definition of a recognizable winery style."

"I first came to understand French wines; now it's a natural focus for me. However, after my first trip to the Napa Valley in 1969, I became aware of the potential of the region. If it weren't for the Copper Mountain project, I would have purchased some Napa Valley land in 1971. As things evolved, I had to postpone that purchase until 1978."

In addition to the initial purchase of one of the oldest chardonnay vineyards in the Napa Valley, Pine Ridge owns or manages vineyards in the Stags Leap District and the areas of Oak Knoll, Rutherford, and Diamond Mountain. Andrus believes that the main

focus of the California wine industry in the late 1970s and early 1980s was trying to figure out how to make clean, quality wine.

"Now, there's a second revolution," Andrus contends. "It's in the vineyard. Virtually every piece of Napa Valley land is planted. We're

not trying to pioneer new areas and we're taking a good look at what the French are doing with chardonnay and cabernet sauvignon and merlot in their vineyards."

In the winery, barrel and malolactic fermentation as well as sur lie aging techniques are employed for the production of chardonnay. Only Burgundian French cooperate is used.

"Proper barrel aging enhances the creamy, mouthfilling character of chardonnay and makes the wine rounder at lower alcohol levels," said Andrus. "The taste of yeast is another complexity level in the wine that adds depth of flavors and additional nuances to the bouquet." Cabernet sauvignon and merlot

production of the Pine Ridge is heavily influenced by Bordeaux winemaking traditions. A fan of cabernet franc, Andrus blends this variety in all his cabernet releases.

Andrus recently announced declassification of all 1988 Cabernet Sauvignon and most of the 1989. He believes that the quality was not there to offer it under the Pine Ridge label.

"I don't want to make massive, tannic, hillside wines. I also don't want to make wines so delicate that there's no interest," Andrus concludes. "I'm looking for balanced elegance and finesse. Wine should have a soft entry in the mouth, but show rich flavor complexities and a lengthy finish like fine Burgundy and Bordeaux wines."

Wine Selections of the Week

The 1990 Pine Ridge Chardonnay, Knollside Cuvee (\$16.50) carries a perfect balance of tropical fruit and flavor complexity derived from barrel fermentation in Burgundian-coopered French oak puncheons and barrels. A full mouth impres-

sion stems from malolactic fermentation and sur lies aging. One of the best from this winery. 1989 Pine Ridge Merlot (\$18) sports solid black cherry fruit with intriguing dusty and chalky nuances. Depthful palate fruit is complemented by well-managed tannins. Eminently ageable wine in a Pomerol style.

That toddling town

Lose the blues in Chicago, the heart of the midwest

When the country goes in search of itself it often lands in the Midwest where beige flatness seems closer to essential truth and where Chicago, the region's capital, is the primordial big city, all granite and brawn and broad, noisy boulevards.

Without the veneer of Hollywood or Broadway it is perhaps the most frankly American of big American cities, surrounded by suburbs and cornfields, proud of its skyscrapers and bratwursts.

At heart Chicago is a journeyman's town with no time for pretension. But if it is an efficient workhorse, it is also a beautiful one. Frank Lloyd Wright, Ludwig Mies van der Rohe and many others have made it a living museum of architecture.

And parks named after two presidents from Illinois — Lincoln and Grant — carpet the city's edge at the foot of steel-and-concrete mountains, with Lake Michigan glowing blue on the horizon.

The city has recovered from a freak underground flood that immobilized the downtown area called the Loop in April and is now settling in for the brilliant summer, when the city becomes the country's biggest beach town.

What to do

At the first hint of summer sun, swimsuit-clad Chicagoans can be seen wrapped in towels and carrying beach chairs past the office buildings and boutiques of Michigan Avenue, past Chanel and Armani and Henri Bendel. They are on their way to the Oak Street Beach, one of the most popular of Chicago's 29 beaches.

Other major beaches include those at North Avenue, Fullerton Avenue and Montrose Avenue.

The city's parks offer a wealth of free activities this time of year. The Grant Park Music Festival (312-819-0614), presents symphonic concerts Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday to Aug. 23. There, the Grant Park Symphony Orchestra, led by such conductors Sarah Caldwell and Michael Morgan, presents anything from Bernstein to Debussy at the park's Petrillo Music Shell at Columbus Drive and Jackson Boulevard.

The 14th annual Jazz Festival (312-744-3315) runs from Sept. 4 to 6, also at the Petrillo Music Shell. Hours are Friday 6 p.m. to 10:30 p.m., Saturday and Sunday 3 p.m. to 10 p.m. Among the performers will be Mel Torme, Diane Schuur and Spiro Gyra.

The Lincoln Park Zoo, 2200 North Cannon Drive (312-294-4660), is one of the few big-city zoos

still free to the public. There, at a working farm, visitors can see cows milked, butter churned, chicks hatched. Polar bears, lions, cheetahs and elephants, among others, are also on view. Open daily 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Briar Street Theater at 3133 North Halsted St. (312-348-4000), is presenting, to Sept. 13, John Guare's "Six Degrees of Separation" with Veronica Hamel. Tickets are \$29.50 to \$35.50.

The Apollo Theater, 2540 North Lincoln Ave. (312-935-6100), presents "Lend Me a Tenor" by Ken Ludwig, with John Astin, to Aug. 23. Tickets are \$27.50 to \$33.50.

Art inside and out

It is a matter of self-esteem that Chicago has the tallest building in the world (Sears Tower, 1,468 feet), the busiest airport (O'Hare) and Michael Jordan. Stature is everything. And architecture is perhaps where Chicago gets to show off most.

Frank Lloyd Wright got his start and spent the first 20 years of his career in suburban Oak Park, 9

miles east of the Loop, where his home and studio stand fully restored. Visitors can see the barrel-vaulted playroom he built for his six children and the octagonal drafting room where he launched the Prairie School of architecture.

Oak Park and adjacent River Forest, with 31 Wright structures between them, are the richest repositories of Wright's work. Guided tours of his home and studio, 951 Chicago Ave., Oak Park, Ill. (708-848-1500), run weekdays at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., and weekends continuously from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The cost is \$6.

Architectural walking tours of the Loop explore early skyscrapers such as the Chicago Board of Trade and the Rookery, or modern buildings such as Sears Tower, the spaceship-shaped State of Illinois Center, and monumental outdoor sculpture by Calder, Picasso and Miro.

The tours, sponsored by the Chicago Architecture Foundation, 224 South Michigan Ave. (312-922-3432), cover a mile and half and last two hours. Tours at a cost of \$7 are given April through September on weekdays at 10 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.; Saturday at 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. and

1:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m., and Sunday at 1:30 p.m.

The rest of the year tours are only at 1:30 p.m. The foundation also gives boat tours along the Chicago River, charting landmarks such as the Wrigley Building, Marina City and the Merchandise Mart. Tours depart daily at 10 a.m., noon, 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. Tickets cost \$15.

The Art Institute of Chicago, Michigan Avenue at Adams Street (312-443-3600), with its treasure of Impressionist and 20th-century American paintings, recently opened new galleries of Chinese, Japanese and Korean art.

Among its current exhibitions are: Master European paintings from the National Gallery of Ireland, featuring works by such artists as Goya, through Aug. 9; and paintings by Jacob Lawrence depicting the lives of abolitionists Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman, to Aug. 6. Open 10:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday; 10:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday; 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday; and noon to 5 p.m. Sunday. Admission is \$6; Tuesday free.

Visitors to the Field Museum of Natural History, Roosevelt Road at South Lake Shore Drive (312-922-9410), can see a collection of robotic insects and arachnids up to 12 feet long in "Backyard Monsters: The World of Insects," to Sept. 7.

Among permanent exhibits are prehistoric skeletons and a re-creation of an Egyptian tomb. Open daily, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is \$4, \$2.50 for children; Thursday free.

Across from the Field Museum, the Shedd Aquarium, 1200 South Lake Shore Drive (312-939-2438), juts out from the shore. Beluga whales and dolphins live in the 2 million-gallon Oceanarium, the centerpiece of a Pacific Northwest coastal re-creation, complete with driftwood and beach pebbles. Open daily, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Admission is \$7; \$5 for children and senior citizens. Advance purchase through Ticketmaster (312-559-0200) is recommended in summer.

Farther south near the University of Chicago the enormously popular Museum of Science and Industry, 57th Street at Lake Shore Drive (312-684-1414), offers hands-on computer exhibitions, simulated subterranean journeys and re-creations of coal mines. Open daily 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. General admission is \$5, \$2 for children; free on Thursday.

Marketing music: Opera buffs love Met shop

For opera buffs — and people buying gifts for them the closest place to heaven on earth is The Metropolitan Opera Shop in New York.

"There is nothing like it anywhere in the United States," said Greg Stauver, the shop's retail manager. It is filled with opera memorabilia, photographs, compact discs, videotapes and opera glasses.

The store is in a bright, airy space tucked into a corner of the Metropolitan Opera House — "the Met" — at Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts on Manhattan's Upper West Side.

The non-profit opera shop and its sister operations, The Performing Arts Shop and The Gallery at Lincoln Center, are operated by The Metropolitan Opera Association. They do business all year, not just during opera season, which is September to April.

"We're open from 10 in the morning right through the second intermission at 10 at night," Stauver says. "In fact, we probably do half our business between 8 and 10 every night. On Saturdays you can't shoehorn a person in here."

Much of the merchandise is commissioned for the shop itself.

One of the hottest items is the Metropolitan Opera Ticket Portfolio, an elegant cowhide wallet with 12 pockets for opera, theater and sports tickets. Available in red or black, it's priced at \$95.

Shoppers can also find a Carissimi Verdi handmade Italian silk scarf decorated with images of 19th-century Verdi opera scores. It costs \$200.

The shop also carries small white Italian-made busts of famous composers. They come in four different sizes and range in price from \$19.95 to \$120.

The busts, which Stauver says are "very sought after," look like marble set on an alabaster base. There are 15 composers available, including Mozart, Verdi, Wagner, Puccini and Beethoven.

"Perhaps one in 10 opera lovers uses opera glasses," said Stauver. The shop carries the Tasco brand in prices ranging from \$95 to \$185.

As for opera glasses made of mother-of-pearl and gold, Stauver says "they're more to be seen with, not to see with." But the shop

stocks a handsome pair for \$125.

"We've had a lot of requests for lorgnettes as well," he says, referring to the classic opera glasses mounted on a handle. "We found some and we'll have them for next season."

The shop carries collectibles too, such as a hand-painted majolica statue of Violetta, the heroine of Verdi's "La Traviata." The statues are made in an edition of 500 and each one sells for \$95.

There is also a large selection of autographed vintage photos, letters and manuscripts, including a signed black-and-white photo of soprano Maria Callas, framed with the program for her performance in "Tosca" at the Met on Feb. 28, 1958. It costs \$750.

For the budget-minded, there's the opera game Triviata for \$29.95; bath towels depicting a scene from "Aida" or "Madame Butterfly" for \$26.95; and mugs decorated with scenes from such operas as "Carmen" and "Der Rosenkavalier" for \$11.95.

The shop's collection of opera

tapes, compact discs and videos is extensive.

Downstairs at The Performing Arts Shop children's gifts are the specialty.

This is where to find a "Peter and the Wolf" T-shirt for \$12.95; a hardcover book of "Madame Butterfly," illustrated by Kim Palmer (Simon & Schuster, 1987), for \$7.98; and a stuffed rabbit in a pink ballet tutu for \$38.

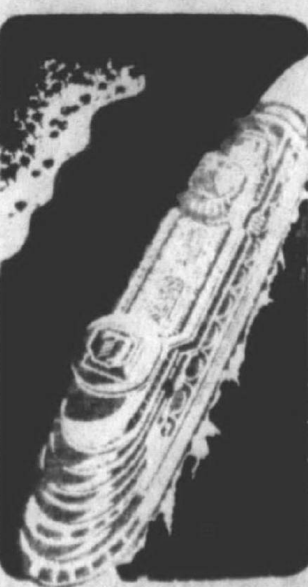

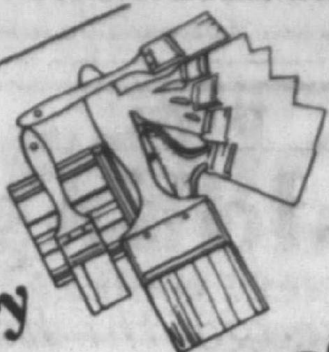

Proper Painting Techniques Add Longevity



When house paint blisters, peels, cracks, flakes or mildews, the tendency is to blame the painter. More often than not, the painter is responsible—not for being a bad painter—but for being unaware of or ignoring the source of the problems.

Professional painters and paint company researchers know that moisture is the worst enemy of paint. It is this aggressor that the average homeowner needs to battle when doing his own painting.

The interior of the average home produces a large amount of moisture throughout the year. It is during the winter, however, that moisture plays the greatest havoc on exterior painted walls. Moisture accumulates on the inside of the walls, where it is eventually drawn through to the outside by the heat of the sun. When moisture goes to work on wood siding and the paint covering it, the result is trouble.

To combat the negative effects of moisture, first find the source. Depending on interior walls can also help. With the moisture problem solved, it's time to take a look at the second enemy of paint—poor surface preparation.

Lack of proper priming, applying new paint over chipped, cracked or chalked paint, or a heavy build-up of old paint is a guarantee that problems will soon follow. Applying a second or third coat before the previous coat completely dries can also lead to trouble.

Begin all painting jobs by properly priming wood and metal surfaces. If the old paint is damaged, use a scraper, paint remover or power sander to remove all loose paint. Then, either featheredge the remaining paint areas or use a filler or caulking to smooth the surface before priming.

If you intend to give your house a second coat of paint, be sure to wait until the first coat has had plenty of time to dry. The improved appearance of your home and the money saved by a paint job that lasts are well worth the extra effort.

Leaky Roof Syndrome

Roof leaks are one of the worst emergency home repairs. While repairs need to be done outside, leaks are generally only noticed during bad weather. One course of action is to use pots, pans, buckets, etc., to catch the water and then wait for the weather to improve. That, however, is not the best approach. You need to locate the source of the leak while it is still raining. If you wait until everything has dried up, you might look forever for the source of that drip.

If possible, look on the underside of the roof (from the attic, for example) for the spot where the water is going through the ceiling. This point of entry is rarely directly over the spot so you have a starting point later. Follow the drip (or wetness) to what appears to be its source. Look for water stains on rafters and, in the daylight, for pinpricks of light in the roof. Take a very careful look around anything that goes through the roof (chimney stack or vent pipe). Areas where two roof slopes meet, such as valleys, dormers and ridgers, deserve special attention. When you think you have found the source, mark it.

At this point, all you may be able to do is find the source. If the problem is so bad it needs immediate attention, staple, tack or nail a sheet of plastic or building paper over the damage. Weigh the risk of venturing onto a wet and possibly windy roof against the potential water damage very carefully.

Once the weather has improved, get on the roof and look for the source of the problem. The way to locate it on the outside is by driving a thin nail up through the roof from the spot you marked inside. The most likely places for leaks to develop occur where asphalt or wood shingles appear cracked or worn, or where slate and tile is broken or even missing. Take a careful look at all places where there is

flashing (the metal seams around objects protruding through the roof), such as chimneys. Also examine areas where different roof slopes meet or where skylights exist.

Small leaks often can be fixed with a liberal application of roofing tar or with caulk squeezed from a caulking gun.

Shingles which are torn, cracked or missing can often be made leak-proof by sliding a piece of flashing in place and then nailing it in place and covering the nail holes with roofing tar. Force the flash-

ing up with a block of wood. You may need to do this on several adjacent courses.

Repairs which involve more than applications of roofing tar can become complicated and are probably best left to professionals. The same is true for repairs in which the shingles are excessively worn, cracked, lacking their gravel coating or, if wooden, covered in moss or split. Asphalt and wood shingles do not last forever. Their deterioration and replacement is eventually unavoidable. Although slate and tile are considerably more expensive, they will last much longer.

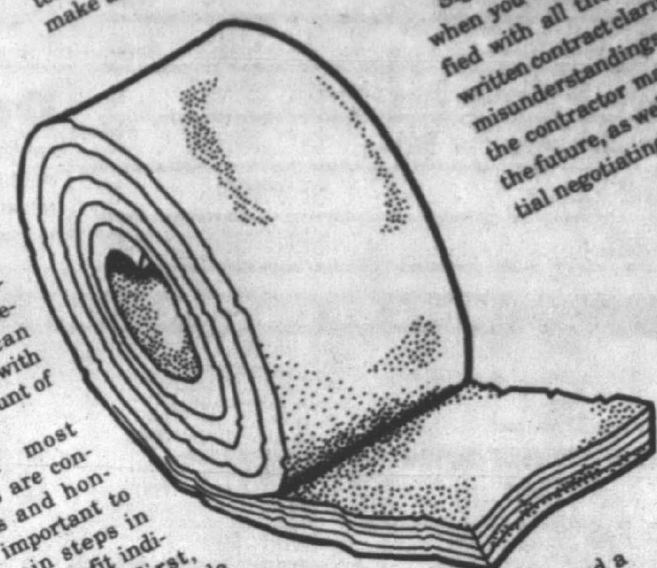

Choosing an Insulation Contractor

Most people are willing to do their own weatherstripping, caulking and other smaller insulation projects that help keep energy bills down. Do not be afraid to contact the small businessman. Often he can give you equally good service at competitive prices. For a list of contractors, turn to the classified section of the newspaper under "Air Conditioning—Heating Contractors."

Other sources include the local chapter of the National Association of Home Builders or Home Builders Association. Areas with local offices for government-funded or non-profit home improvement assistance centers will also have a file on reputable area contractors.



From these sources, choose three or four contractors. Narrow the list by investigating each one's business reputation. Upon request, most contractors will gladly furnish you with a list of past customers. Call a number of these customers and ask how satisfied they were with the completed job. See how long the contractor has been in business. As a rule of thumb, the longer the better.

Call the Better Business Bureau and give them your list of choices. They will tell you if and how many complaints have been made against each contractor.

Hoop enthusiasts court a dream

■ The George family, formerly of Farmington Hills and now living in Plymouth, brought a dream to fruition when it had a full-length basketball court built in its backyard.

Ken George, the assistant director of admissions at Albion College, has more than just mom's home cooking to look forward to when he visits his parents' home in Plymouth Township.

With a 75-by-50-foot basketball court sitting on three acres of land owned by George's parents, Jim and Mary Ellen, 4-on-4 full-court basketball games have become as popular as outdoor barbecues.

It's not uncommon to see Ken and a bunch of his friends from Albion College and Farmington Hills Harrison High School playing games on the blacktop surface on Sunday afternoons.

Ken's sister, Debbie, prefers to watch. "Most of my buddies live in Farmington, Birmingham and East Lansing but they make the drive," said George, who played four years at Albion College and now also is an assistant coach at the school.

"I used to play all the time in my driveway — that's where I fell in love with the game. But if I would have had this court when I was younger I would have played all day, every day. More than one person has compared it to the 'Field of Dreams' movie."

Located right in front of some shrubs and woods in the George's backyard, the setting is similar but minus "Shoeless" Joe Jackson coming out of the cornfields, of course.

The court, which cost about \$3,000 and was installed last September, even has a three-point shooting arc. The arc is shorter than the 19-foot, 9-inch three-point line used in the college game and the rims are about 9 1/4 feet high instead of the regulation 10 feet.

"That's so even you can dunk," Jim George said to a reporter.

Jim George teaches history at Livonia Stevenson and also has extensive coaching experience, having coached the varsity baseball and varsity girls basketball teams at Stevenson in the 1980s. Before that he was the head basketball coach at Holmes Middle School in Livonia.

This is the seventh home the Georges have had since getting married 27 years ago, but it may as well be called "Seventh Heaven."

Along with the basketball court, a 15-foot deep swimming pond is adjacent to the house as is a golf pin so the family members also can work on their golf game.

"We thought this would be a way to get exercise and to get Ken to come home on the weekends," Jim joked. "We used to have a backyard basket like everyone else (at their last home in Farmington Hills) but still it was a driveway — and a slanted one at that."

The basketball court isn't reserved only for the younger set. Jim George

Mercy plans homecoming for Mallon

Meg Mallon might be the most popular Mercy High School graduate, and her alma mater remains just as popular with Mallon.

Now a nationally known sports figure and successful member of the Ladies Professional Golf Association, she will lend her support Sept. 1 at the Second Annual Meg Mallon Golf Outing and Tribute Dinner to benefit Mercy.

"When she sat down to put together this year's schedule, the first thing she said was to set aside time for that," said Paul Mallon, one of Meg's brothers and biggest fans. "She had a real good experience at Mercy, and she wants to give back to the school."

The event raised \$42,000 for the Mercy general fund last year, and the goal is \$50,000 this year, according to school spokeswoman Johanna Monaghan.

"People respond to Meg because she's such a great champion and has such a wonderful personality," Monaghan said. "It's kind of like a homecoming."

Following the golf at Edgewood County Club in Union Lake, Merrily Dean Baker, the new Michigan

State University athletic director, and Mel Farr, the former Detroit Lion and area businessman, will receive the Mercy Sports Achievement Award at the Tribute Dinner.

Baker will be honored as the "first woman AD at a Big Ten school, and she's also a big Meg Mallon fan and quite a golfer, too," Monaghan said.

Farr and his family have a long-standing friendship with the Mallons, going back to his days as a Lions running back in the late 1960s and early '70s.

When knee injuries threatened to end his football career, Farr looked to the auto business as his post-NFL career. Meg's father, John Mallon, was in charge of the minority dealership development program for Ford Motor Co. and helped get Farr, who now owns four dealerships, started in the business.

Farr returned the favor in 1986 when Meg turned professional. He was among the businessmen who sponsored her "when no other sponsors were knocking down the door," Paul Mallon said.

"That debt has since been retired by Meg, but there's a closeness that remains," Monaghan said.

Mallon, who won her first tournament last year and

four overall, including the LPGA and Women's U.S. Open titles, has no wins yet this year but is having another fine season.

Having played in 17 tournaments, Mallon has 11 top-10 finishes, which is second best on the Tour. She was second in the Inamori (San Diego) and Phar-Mor (Youngstown) events.

Mallon, who earned \$28,000 for finishing fourth in the U.S. Open July 19, is seventh on the money list this year with \$308,045.

"It was tough for awhile because of the expectations placed on her," Paul Mallon said. "Some people think because she has not been in the winner's circle, the year has been a disappointment, but she doesn't look at it that way at all. The people involved with golf know she's having a good year."

Mallon's success last year brought numerous honors, too. She recently received the Jim Thorpe Award as the Female Golfer Of The Year for 1991. Pat Bradley and Beth Daniels also were finalists for the award.

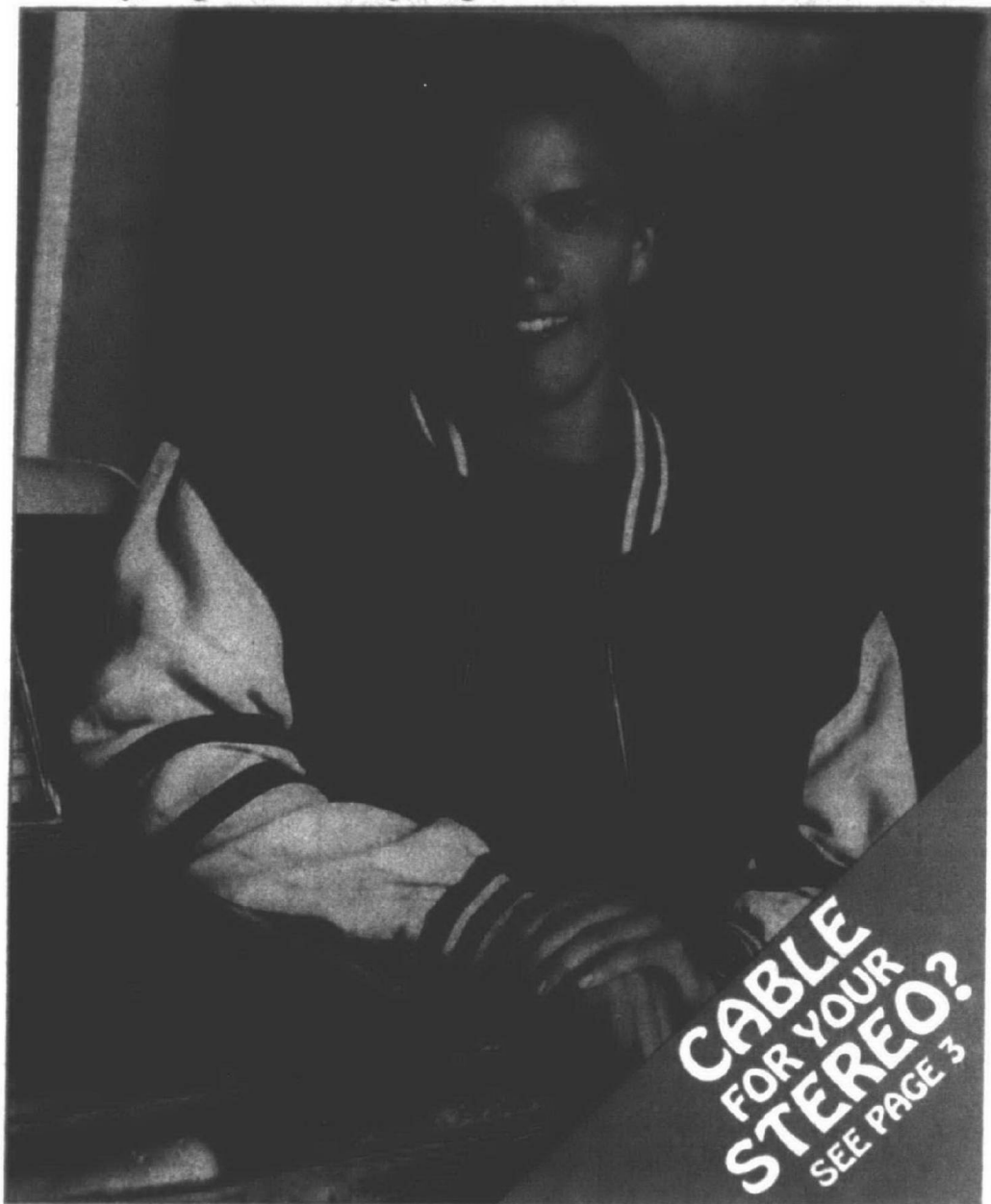

Other series Home to move in on Spelling's turf

Wanted Millions of young viewers to frequent bohemian Hollywood apartment complex with pool. Shown by appointment on Wednesday nights. Vicarious pleasure guaranteed.

That's *Melrose Place*, the *Beverly Hills, 90210* spinoff that won the ratings race in its second week on the air. The Fox series, airing on Wednesdays, features an ensemble cast of eight attractive actors playing a group of men and women in their 20s who live in a Los Angeles Courtyard apartment building.

Melrose is but the first of a glut of such property set to hit the market this summer and fall. But if creator Darren Star and Executive producer Aaron Spelling (*Beverly Hills, 90210*) have their way, you'll already have a long-term agreement with their show, which debuted July 8, that precludes success for the competition.

It doesn't take an accountant to see how calculated the series' early success has been. First, brooding lead actor Grant Show was introduced to audiences as Jake Hanson, the older man who taught *90210*'s also-brooding ladies' man Luke Perry everything he knew—a sort of resume by inference. In May, Show appeared on two episodes of *90210* and an equal number of national magazine covers. The Fox network made it clear that we could address any further inquiries to *Melrose Place*.

Who is lucky enough to share an address with Jake? Also paying rent are: an aspiring designer (Josie Bissett) and her medical-intern husband (Thoms Calabro, at 33 the oldest cast member), a Southern bombshell (Amy Locane), an aerobics instructor (Vanessa Williams—no, not the former Miss America), an entry-level office worker (Courtney Thorne-Smith) fresh out of college, a social worker (Doug Savant) and an

aspiring writer (Andrew Shue).

After these announcements, the publicity machine shut down, waiting for demand to build. Interviews were kept to a minimum, and no advance copy of the show was available for screening by critics, who usually help to spread the word about new series. One national magazine even contacted Los Angeles-based reporters with offers of cash for interview tapes. Meanwhile portraits of the cast—by top art photographer Annie Liebowitz—went on display at The Gap stores everywhere.

The plan was a success. Viewership of the 90-minute premiere was exceeded only by that of the second episode, which drew more viewers than the competition on ABC, CBS and NBC, which were covering the third night of the Democratic National Convention.

If *Melrose Place* continues to establish itself in these still-early weeks, it may doom the competition, which ranges from libidinous *Freshman Dorm* to soft-porn *200 Malibu Road*. On Fox alone, the

fall-season competition includes a campus drama, *Class of '96*, and *The Heights*, a drama about a garage band.

"Our show is setting the standard for what these other shows are about," says Star, who based *Melrose* on his own early experiences living in Los Angeles.

One of the show's most unusual elements is the presence of a gay character, Savant's Matt Fielding. Spelling thinks it's important for his young audience to see others accepting a gay friend on his own terms.

and the actor agrees, adding, "I think we have an opportunity to present a very positive role model for a lot of gay teens."

Locane is not so sanguine about her character. Southern vixen Sandy Louis Harling, who works as a cocktail waitress while waiting for her big break in show business.

"I really don't like anything about Sandy," the New Jersey-bred actress insists.

Shue is more excited about his character, Billy Campbell, who is Thorne-Smith's roommate.

"I'm going through the same things that my character's going through, as far as making career

choices, figuring out who I want to go out with, who my friends are gonna be things like that," Shue says. He's pragmatic about the chances of success for any of the look-alike shows.

"I haven't seen any of the other shows, (but) I've read a couple of the scripts. I have a feeling they're all going to be a lot alike. I think it will come down to the specific writing, and the actors in each one. I can't imagine that they will all last."

By the end of September, the casts of at least some of these shows should expect to be checking the Help Wanted section.

Karen and Sarah Josephson: double-shot at Olympic gold



In their many years of competition, twin sisters Karen and Sarah Josephson have won every major prize in the field of synchronized swimming except for the Olympic gold medal. Now, in Barcelona, Spain, they're trying once more.

Synchronized swimmers in last competition

In sports, the term "natural" usually refers to an innate, extraordinary ability to perform. It can also mean a special physical endowment, say, excessive height for basketball players. In either case, the synchronized swimming duet team of identical twins Karen and Sarah Josephson is definitely a natural. The United States team members are highly favored in this year's Summer Olympics.

The 28-year-old sisters started competing in synchronized swimming shortly after they entered the sport at age 6. By the time they were sweet 16, they were international competitors. Sarah, who is seven minutes younger than her sister, downplays the advantage they have in the sport as twins. "When we first do things they're usually more matched, but we have to work at being synchronized just as hard as anyone else," she says.

Work hard they do, and it has certainly paid off for them over the years. Last year the Josephsons won the first-ever World Championship duet title in Australia, having the highest overall score ever recorded in international duet competition. They've won gold medals at the 1991 Rome Open, the Pan-Pacific Championships, the 1987 Pan-Am Games and were champions of the 1990 Goodwill Games. On the home front, they have been national champions seven times.

But it is the Olympic Games the two have yet to conquer. They were silver medalists in the 1988 Games in Seoul, Korea, finishing behind a Canadian duo. This week marks their last chance at Olympic gold; the Josephsons are retiring from competition. Even if they had gone on to the 1996 Games, their natural edge would have been lost, for the duet and solo synchronized swimming events will be eliminated then in favor of eight-women team events. "Personally, I'm kind of sad that the solo and duet events are gone," Sarah laments, "especially the duets, because that's been our specialty. But I think it'll be a good move for the sport."

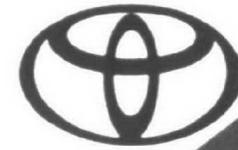
