McIlhargey seeks vote recount



Charles McIlhargey, who was narrowly defeated Aug. 4 in the Republican primary township supervisor race by Kathleen Keen-McCarthy, said Friday he'll seek a recount to satisfy his campaign workers.

A recount of the Aug. 4 Republican primary election in Plymouth Township will be requested today, said Charles McIlhargey.

McIlhargey, the township building director who lost to Kathleen Keen-McCarthy by 21 votes, said he would seek a recount "just to satisfy all the people who worked so hard on the campaign — it's nothing against her."

According to the county elections division office, someone seeking an election recount must first file their request with the local clerk's office.

The county elections board then meets, and can order a recount only if a specific reason is given to suggest a recount is needed, according to the elections office.

If that reason is determined to be valid cause for conducting a recount, the county then performs it, and has 30

days to complete the task.

The deadline for asking for a recount is Tuesday, said township clerk Esther Hulsing.

The election results certified by the township clerk's office had Keen-McCarthy with 1,241 votes and McIlhargey with 1,220 votes.

Township trustee John Stewart finished third with 994 votes, and attorney Stephen Boak fourth with 477.

Hulsing said 759 ballots were voided when those voters crossed party lines on their ballots.

She said those ballots will remain voided, despite a recount.

A party seeking a recount must post a \$10 deposit for each precinct to be

counted — \$200 to count all 20 township precincts.

If the county does perform the recount, they send a bill to the township clerk, who sends it to the party that requested the recount, Hulsing said.

After a recount, "It's a rarity where the results are changed, but that doesn't mean it doesn't happen," said George Herstek, assistant to the state director of elections.

In recent years, a state House election in Oakland County showed a candidate winning by one vote — a margin that stood after a recount.

Then again, Herstek said that a winner has turned out to be a loser, after a recount.

Crash victim from Plymouth, had strong desire to help kids

People who show up at the Novi Hilton Aug. 29 for trainer/consultant Tamara Behiry's seminar on "Mapping Out your Future" and "Turning Turmoil into Triumph" will be saddened to hear that the Plymouth Township resident died in an airplane crash.

Behiry, the single mother of two young children, was starting her own counseling service, and was good at counseling kids, said one of her former employers.

Behiry, 36, died in a plane crash in northern Michigan last week, along with her 2-year-old son Brenton Perry and Livonia pilot Robert Lee Shirley.

The Crawford County Sheriff's Department reported that at 7:19 p.m. Thursday, they were told by a civilian pilot that a plane was down in swampy woods in Frederic Township, eight

miles west of the Grayling Airport.

Guard helped

The National Guard helped ground rescuers by sending a Guard helicopter to direct officers to the site.

Upon reaching the scene, investigators found that three persons had died in the Cessna 172 four-seater aircraft — Shirley, 67; Behiry, and her young son. The plane went down in an area described as remote, and "very woody and swampy," said sheriff's department spokeswoman Patricia Park.

The flight originated at Mettetal Airport in Canton Township. Pilots and employees at Mettetal Friday said they knew Shirley by nod hello to. He was retired and flew for recreation, they said.

Mettetal had no flight plan for Shirley, nor a record of when he flew out of the airport. Private, uncontrolled airports aren't required to track airplanes'

arrivals and departures. Pilots using small airports are not required to communicate by radio. If they're flying under visual flight rules, pilots do not have to file flight plans.

Behiry, who held a bachelor's degree from Spring Arbor College in psychology, got some of her first experience as a counselor working with kids at the Faithway Baptist School in Ypsilanti, headed by Richard Adams.

"I was shocked to hear of it," Adams said of the crash.

"She was just here last week making copies. She said she was going to visit relatives in Manistique.

"I was impressed with her desire to help kids and her ability to speak to kids at our school," Adams said.

Politics worries workers

It's not the economy that has one group of local employees worried about job security.

It's politics.

Several employees at the Charter Township of Plymouth offices at Ann Arbor and Lilley roads say they're worried about keeping their jobs, after Kathleen Keen-McCarthy's victory in the Republican primary for township supervisor Aug. 4.

Keen-McCarthy has yet to face independent candidate Ron Edwards in the November general election. But most see her as the likely winner in the heavily Republican township, where GOP primary winners traditionally prevail in general elections.

Police Chief Carl Berry was a supporter of township building director Charles McIlhargey and was pictured in some McIlhargey campaign literature. McIlhargey lost by 21 votes.

"Kathleen Keen-McCarthy was elected by the residents of this township, and I'm proud of that fact," Berry said. "Charlie McIlhargey ran a good, honest campaign, he didn't personally attack Kathleen, and I'm proud of that. But that election is over.

"She's going to get 110 percent out of me and out of this staff," Berry said.

"I hope to stay on as chief of police, and if she wants more, she'll get 120 percent," he said.

Vorva is nearly assured of victory in the November general election, as he faces no challenger. Plymouth mayor Robert Jones said that after the election, "I would assume he would resign."

Lower taxes

City of Plymouth residents who have received their

tax bills may have noticed a slight drop.

Or, at least that's what city officials are hoping. In a recent flier sent to residents, Steven Walters, city manager, pointed out the 5.6 percent drop.

He gives an example, using a house valued at \$50,000. In 1991 the city taxes were \$718.50, while in 1992 they are \$678.50.

Walters says the reason for the drop is threefold. First is a refund on a lawsuit; second, curbside recycling; and third, budget adjustments.

Deal dumped?

City officials meet to discuss landfill options

Plymouth and Salem Township officials are at odds over an old garbage dump.

The city commission has scheduled a special meeting for 7 p.m. today to discuss possible options, including legal action against Salem Township.

The story starts earlier this year, when the federal government came up with \$600,000 to help the city pay to close a former city dump in Salem Township.

That helped, but the city still had to come up with another \$1 million to cover the dump with clay and soil as the Department of Natural Resources has ordered. The dump was

last used in the 1960s.

Then in June, a city commissioner and developer, Jim Jabara, told fellow commissioners that if the city offered to dig a 10-acre lake in Salem Township for a land developer, the city could have the clay for free — and save half of that \$1 million.

All that was needed was a quick OK from Salem Township officials, to meet a Nov. 1 deadline for the city using the grant.

Yet, "We haven't been very successful," said city manager Steve Walters.

"They say we need approval from their planning commission for a couple of different things," he said.

For one, Salem Township is re-

quiring plat approval for the subdivision in which the lake is to be the center, he said.

The city maintains that by obtaining a building permit, the digging and clay removal can happen — without Salem Township planning commission approval for the project.

City attorney Ron Lowe met with legal counsel for Salem Township on Tuesday and Thursday. The two were to talk again by today.

"A delay on the part of Salem Township officials will harm us significantly," Walters said.

Suzanne Witthoff, Salem Township treasurer, said some planning officials met with city engineer Ken West on Friday, adding the city

must decide whether to seek approval for the project under the zoning ordinance or through the planning commission.

The city closed the landfill on Chubb Road according to DNR guidelines in the 1960s.

But in recent years, the DNR told the city more money would have to be spent, to close the dump in a way deemed proper by the DNR.

West said options to consider could have included finding a source of clay in either Plymouth Township or Superior Township — but to get clay in either community "would also involve a soils investigation and the development of a plan," West said, a process deemed too time consuming.

Several township employees say privately they're "very worried" about having a job once the new supervisor takes office, as many actively supported McIlhargy.

"There's a lot of that talk, I think a lot of people are concerned," said Jim Anulewicz, township director of public services who also supported McIlhargy.

"I'm not apprehensive, I'm here to move forward," Anulewicz said.

"I was in the army, you're constantly changing captains, there are new people coming in all the time. You have to stay focused on your mission.

"I've stuck my nose to the grindstone and unless there's cause, I don't expect to be removed," Anulewicz said.

"It's a shame to have that kind of cloud hanging, you need to have the air cleared immediately," he said.

Keen-McCarthy said she doesn't want people to be worried about their job future.

"My philosophy is I want good people doing a good job for the citizens of this township, that's what you need to keep doing through this transition period," she said.

"An administrator does not go in and say 'You're out of here.' You set goals and objectives and talk with people, try to create a team. I don't have any intention of getting rid of people immediately."

Left Saturday

Nick Karr, 11, was Behiry's neighbor at the Plymouth Manor apartments and was babysitting Behiry's cat and two turtles.

"She left Saturday to go up north to see her father," said Nick, who regularly babysat Brenton and his 7-year-old sister, Lynnette.

"Tamara's dad was supposed to be in some kind of play. Brenton was going up to see his grandpa for the first time. Lynnette went out to New York to see her dad while her mom went up north," he said.

Behiry's neighbors didn't know Shirley, and guessed he was a pilot she hired. They were due back Tuesday, the Karrs said.

Nick said Brenton "was really cute. He had sandy blond hair and blue eyes. He was fun to babysit for. He was really playful. As soon as he got up from his nap, he'd say, 'I want to go outside.' Lynnette helped out a lot," added Nick. "Her mom had her do the dishes, and she'd offer to do them when I was babysitting."

"They were just beautiful kids," said Katy Karr, 15. "Tamara was very friendly. She put a lot of energy into trying to be friends with you. People liked her. She definitely was a people person. It was a shock to hear about the crash on the news."

Richard Egli, community relations director for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, knew Behiry and thought highly of her.

Recently moved

She'd recently moved to Plymouth Township and transferred Lynnette from Fiegel Elementary to Allen, where she was registered to start first grade in the fall, Egli said.

Behiry, who ran a parent-teen support group at Plymouth Canton High School, took a time management class from Egli. "She was an aspiring speaker herself and wanted to be involved in anything I could think of that would be helpful for her," he said. "She seemed to be doing all the right things to become established as a trainer and speaker."

"I'm stunned. This is really tragic. It's hard to imagine that someone you know is one day vital and alive, and no longer here the next. You know it happens, but you don't think it will ever happen to people you know."

In a recent interview with the Observer, Behiry said her long-term goal was to some day open her own residential treatment center with a Christian emphasis.

Teenagers were special to her. "I've found teens are really hurt because their parents feel it's too late to try and help them," she told a reporter. "And I've found parents who say their children are out of control or they're too wrapped up in their own activities and don't have time for their kids."

Behiry strived to "get parents and teens to interact and tear down the walls they've been building for years. The first step is to make the time; parents have to make that commitment. Two hours once a

week is nothing to give yourself happiness in the home."

The fuel question

Major Jerry Foehl, public affairs officer at Camp Grayling, said the plane was southbound when it crashed, leading officials to surmise that Shirley decided to refuel in Grayling before continuing on to the Upper Peninsula.

An Associated Press reported said the pilot planned to refuel in Pellston, about 75 miles north of Grayling.

There was no radio contact with the Grayling Army air field, said Foehl.

"It's 375 miles from Plymouth to

Manistique," he said. "They perhaps looked at the fuel gauge and said, 'Yeah, we ought to stop and get some fuel.' I doubt they would be out of fuel, but on the other hand, if they were going a total of 375 miles, it might have put him so close he figured it was not wise to chance that. They were heading over water for the last 80 or so miles."

Manistique is on the north edge of Lake Michigan, 89 miles west of St. Ignace. The plane was found on state-owned land "which is primarily jackpines and used for military training," said Foehl. "It's kind of remote. It's not near any neighborhoods, subdivisions or populated areas."

Funeral arrangements were being handled by the McCabe Funeral Home, Farmington Hills.

Traditionally, the mayor appoints a candidate to fill the commission seat, who must then be approved by a majority of commissioners.

Jones was the last commissioner named to fill a vacancy, after former mayor Dennis Bila resigned in spring 1991. That term expired last November, when Jones ran and was re-elected to the commission by voters.

One key reason commissioners said they selected Jones to fill the seat was that he was the highest vote-getter among commission candidates who lost in the 1990 race.

If that premise guides the commission this time, former commissioner Ron Loiselle would get the

appointment, as he was the highest vote-getter finishing out of the running.

But Jones said that vote totals of commissioners who didn't make it "is one of the criteria" he and the commission will review.

"There are many things we can look at," Jones said, adding that the commission will wait "a little bit" before considering candidates.

Loiselle, currently serving on the city planning commission, said, "I would be very interested," in an appointment to the city commission.

Finishing next behind Loiselle was Rosita Smith, also on the city planning commission. "I'd be honored," she said, adding "It's up to them, really."

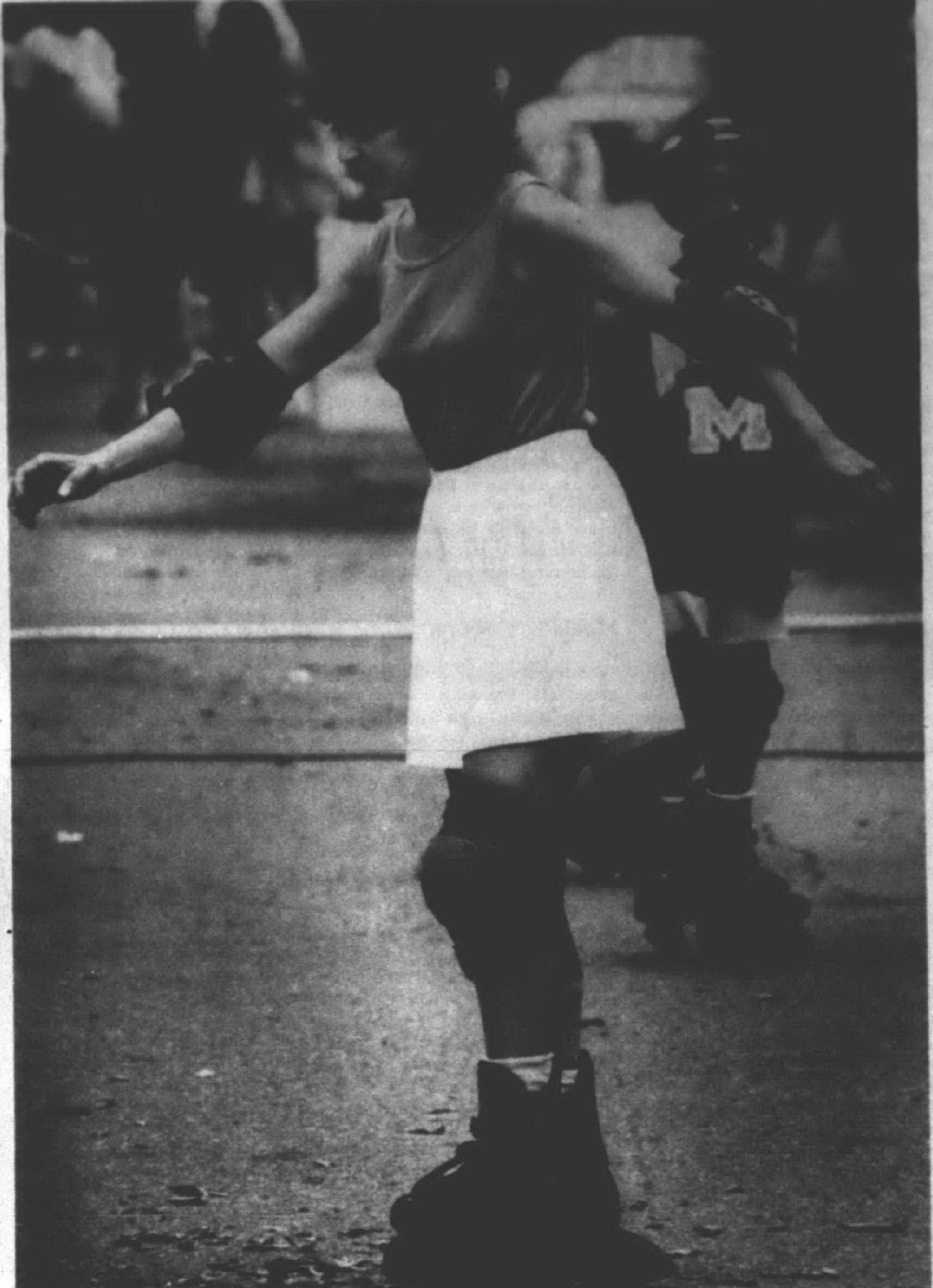

Engler commits support to Whyman's campaign

Now that Canton is on the map, Republicans from all over the state are expected to show up in the community this fall.

But it's not because State Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton, won his battle with the state Department of Transportation to get the map designation.

It's to do battle with Kosteva. And chances are Gov. John Engler, the state's top Republican, won't need a road map to get to Canton to campaign for Deborah Whyman.

The GOP has targeted the new 21st House district as one they can possibly win. The state House is dominated by Democrats, but the Republicans could gain control by winning six House races in November.

narily follows the recommendations of the Republican Caucus Campaign Committee regarding which candidates he'll help personally, but his promise to Whyman is a notable exception.

"He has not made hardly any commitments like that, so this one stands alone," Truscott said. "We're reluctant to commit him to a lot of people."

But while Whyman has support from the top, Canton Township's top Republican, Tom Yack, township supervisor, said he is going to sit on the fence during the election.

"I'm going to have to work with whoever wins," said Yack. "Oh, sure, I'll show up when Engler comes, but I won't be doing any fund-raising for Whyman."

Yack said Whyman has support from the right-to-life groups and probably won't need to raise much money locally.

Plenty of money will be needed for the race, according to Kosteva, who has said each side could spend as much as \$200,000 in the battle.

Both Whyman and Kosteva have right-to-life political stances.

Engler's pending appearance lends credence to the buzz that Republicans have targeted Kosteva's 21st district for a special effort.

Michigan Republican State Com-

mittee spokesman Bryan Flood won't say if any state House district has been targeted, but added that "if there were (targeted districts) I think this race would be one of them. This race is winnable. It's a seat that we're definitely interested in getting."

Kosteva said last week that he believes the district is targeted by Republicans. Besides, since all House districts were rearranged earlier this year, the new 21st district is more heavily populated with Republicans than the old 21st district.

In the redistricting, Kosteva lost the Democratic stronghold of Wayne and picked up more of Canton Township which has become increasingly Republican.

That's one reason why Engler has promised to speak at a Whyman fund-raiser sometime before the general election in November.

"Debbie talked to (Engler) a number of times and he's extremely impressed," said Engler aide John Truscott.

No left turn

Motorists confused by new rule

Tracy Green of Plymouth hopes area motorists aren't as unlucky as she was last week when she turned left off of Ann Arbor onto Beck and to her amazement got a \$65 ticket for an illegal left turn.

At the Plymouth Township's request, Wayne County recently installed a traffic signal at the intersection, which township Police Chief Carl Berry says has become increasingly dangerous since Beck Road was paved.

"I was just driving last week and all of a sudden I come up to a light I didn't even know was there," said Green. "I was looking at the light and didn't pay attention to the signs. All of a sudden, I make a left turn and a cop is behind me, and pulls me over. I thought what's going on?"

"I couldn't believe I got the ticket. The officer told me he'd probably write 10 more tickets before his shift was over." Green's guess is that "they'll probably take the money they make from the tickets and widen the road."

Berry says the traffic signal is the result of three months' work.

"We have experienced a large amount of accidents there since they paved Beck Road," he said. "We had to go along with the no left turn to get the light put in, and the light is absolutely essential. The reason for the no left turn is that traffic (caused by cars turning left) backs up, and people coming around that curve have an insufficient amount of sight and time to stop the car."

Plans call for a left turn lane to be constructed in the next year or two, he said.

Berry said he's sorry people are inconvenienced, "but it's really a strong safety measure. It's a high accident corner. It's an extremely dangerous intersection."

Berry said he doesn't doubt officers are writing more than 10 tickets a shift. "She's (Green) probably right," he said. "We've tried to warn people, but obviously we don't catch everyone during the warning period. If we can't get them to stop turning left, we're going to have some bad accidents."

"It's probably one of the most dangerous intersections in the

community as far as traffic is concerned. There's not a huge amount, but the traffic that's there is moving at a quick speed."

Ann Arbor Road, a state highway, is hilly with several curves. Average traveling speed ranges between 45-55. Speed limits on Beck are 35 and 40, but that road is also hilly, and services a number of new residential developments.

A new home

Firm stands by community, builds locally

A two-story, 18th-century-style building going up on Ann Arbor Trail, west of Harvey, will be the new home of Post, Smythe, Lutz & Ziel, an accounting firm that has been in the city of Plymouth since 1961.

Anticipated move-in date is Oct. 1.

The firm has two offices, in Plymouth and Wayne. The Plymouth office move has been four years in planning, according to Dennis Siegner, co-owner with David Williamson of the Plymouth

office. After looking at existing structures, the firm decided to build a facility designed to meet its needs within the city.

In May 1991, the land now under construction was identified as the future site, said Siegner, and the firm felt the time was right because the cost of construction would be manageable.

"We believe in the community," said Siegner, regarding the decision to build in the city of Plymouth. "Our client base is here. We feel it is in the best location for the future of our firm."

Post, Smythe outgrew its current

facility, according to Siegner, who has been with the firm 15 years.

The current facility which houses 12 employees and services clients is 1,800 square feet. The firm leases the office space from retired owners Roland Lutz and Harvey Ziel. It is now for sale or lease.

The new 6,000 square-foot site will be owned by Siegner, Williamson and Robert Bake, a local real estate broker. The building will include 2,000 square feet for storage and 4,000 square feet of office space.

At the new building, the firm will also have capacity for a cable hook-up that will enable it to handle fi-

beroptics from local area networks. The target date for the local area network is three years.

The building was designed by Plymouth architect Joe Phillips and his intern, Stanley Cole. It will be handicap-accessible without ramps.

At the current site, Siegner said his partner serviced a handicapped client in the client's van. After the move, that client will be able to come into the office. He said the facility also will be easier for elderly clients to use.

"All the staff will enjoy the ambiance of being downtown," said Siegner.

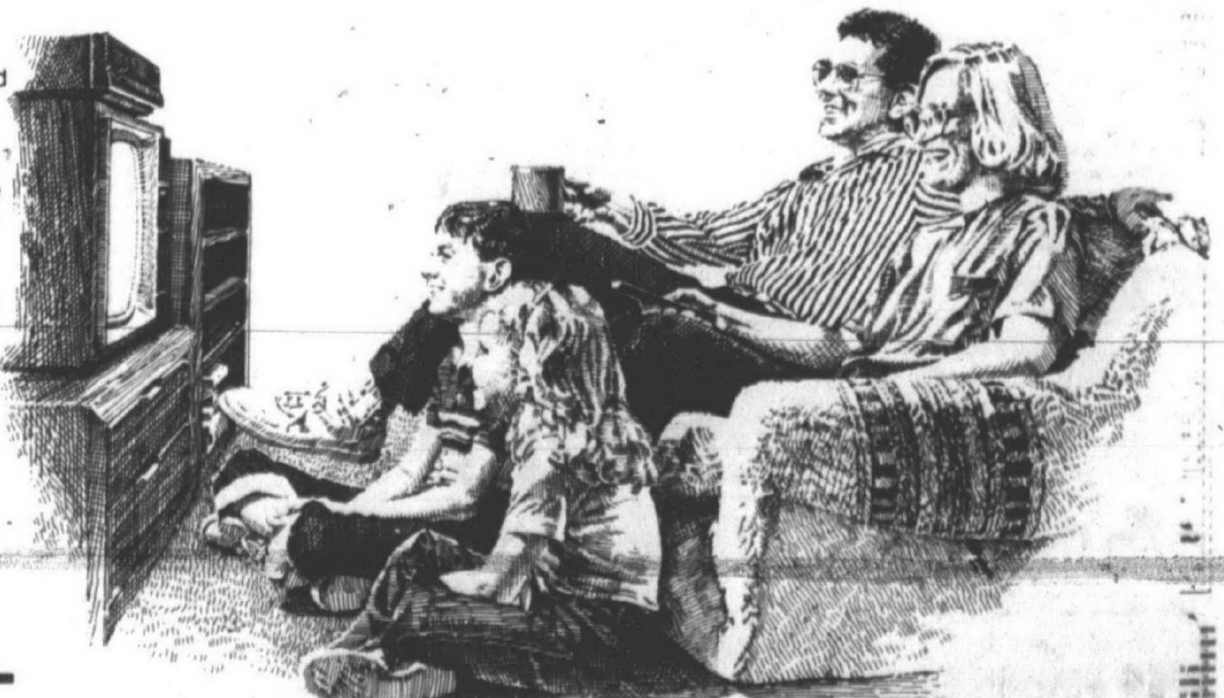

Independent announces bid for Congress in 13th District

ELECTION

Randall F. Roe of Ypsilanti plans to make it a four-man race for the U.S. House of Representatives from the 13th District.

Roe, 31, is running as an independent on the November ballot. He'll face Democrat William D. Ford, Republican R. Robert Geake and Tisch candidate Paul S. Jensen.

The 13th District includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, Plymouth, part of Livonia, Plymouth Township and other communities in Wayne and Washtenaw counties.

Roe holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from Eastern Michigan University. He works at General Motors and is completing a master's degree in manufacturing and management at General Motors Institute.

Roe said he is seeking office because "current leaders are not addressing the needs of this nation equitably."

"They are directing us to third world status. The U.S. standard of living is rapidly decreasing and none of these alleged leaders are addressing that fact," Roe stated.

"Our futures and the futures of our children are being sacrificed," said Roe in a written statement announcing his candidacy.

"We had a two-party system in this country that has eroded into a one-party system and is failing miserably. Congress is giving our manufacturing base away, taxing us to death and bringing us to our knees in serving big business," stated Roe.

Roe opposes the free trade agree-

ment with Mexico.

"We must return to free enterprise; not free trade.

"Big businesses are funding foreign factories with our American taxpayers' money. Congress has allowed big business to expand their investments and steal our children's futures."

On other key issues:

• **Income tax:** Roe proposes a flat tax rate of 8 percent after deductions for American citizens. Others will be taxed at a significantly higher rate not to exceed 60 percent. Roe also proposes that any citizen with a high school diploma can choose any single year before their 30th birthday to be exempt from federal income taxes and any citizen with a minimum four year college degree can choose any three consecutive years, prior to their 30th birthday, to be tax exempt.

• **Education:** Bureaucracy must be reduced. Roe proposed that local

authorities control the money of their district and that "teachers need autonomy to set curriculum and hold back students if necessary."

• **National defense:** He charges that past leaders have not been honest about threats to security.

"We have spent trillions for defense and for what? The Russians were 'going to bury' us. When the Iron Curtain came down opening up markets for big businesses, we found that the Russians can't even feed themselves. There is money in war; the arms business is very lucrative."

Roe favors capital punishment but also believes the judicial system must get tough with white collar criminals. He called for a halt to foreign aid because "we have citizens sleeping under bridges and we are giving money away."

Roe is married and the father of two children. He owns three cars "all American made."

Area Perot supporters will take platform to other candidates

They don't have a candidate, but supporters of H. Ross Perot are still trying to draft an election platform.

"We want to get something together that we can take to other candidates at all levels," said Bill Farrant of Westland. "If they sign on, fine. If they don't, we'll tell them we're going to go vote for the other guy."

That "other guy," as far as the presidential race is concerned, could still be Perot.

Though the Texas billionaire said he wouldn't actively campaign for the presidency, his Michigan supporters nonetheless filed sufficient petitions to have his name placed on the state ballot.

Right now, Farrant said, supporters are putting most of their effort into drafting a Perot-like platform. It likely won't be easy.

Though Farrant — like Perot — doesn't believe abortion is a mat-

ter of individual choice, he acknowledges several other Perot supporters are pro-life.

He himself differs from Perot's pro-gun control stance. "It's a nice idea, but you're not going to take guns away from criminals," Farrant said.

Perot's proposed economic plan, a mix of tax increases, spending cuts and tough budgeting for entitlement programs such as Social Security drew Farrant's support even though national commentators hinted the bad news message drove Perot from the race.

"Sure it's bad medicine, but sometimes you have to take bad

medicine to get well," Farrant said, echoing Perot's own no-nonsense speaking style.

The Michigan Perot campaign splintered somewhat after its initial, volunteer director was replaced by a political professional, though Farrant defended the move.

The goal is to keep supporters together as a political force, if not as a basis for a new political party.

"We want to find out just what it is people want and then take that to the candidates," Farrant said.

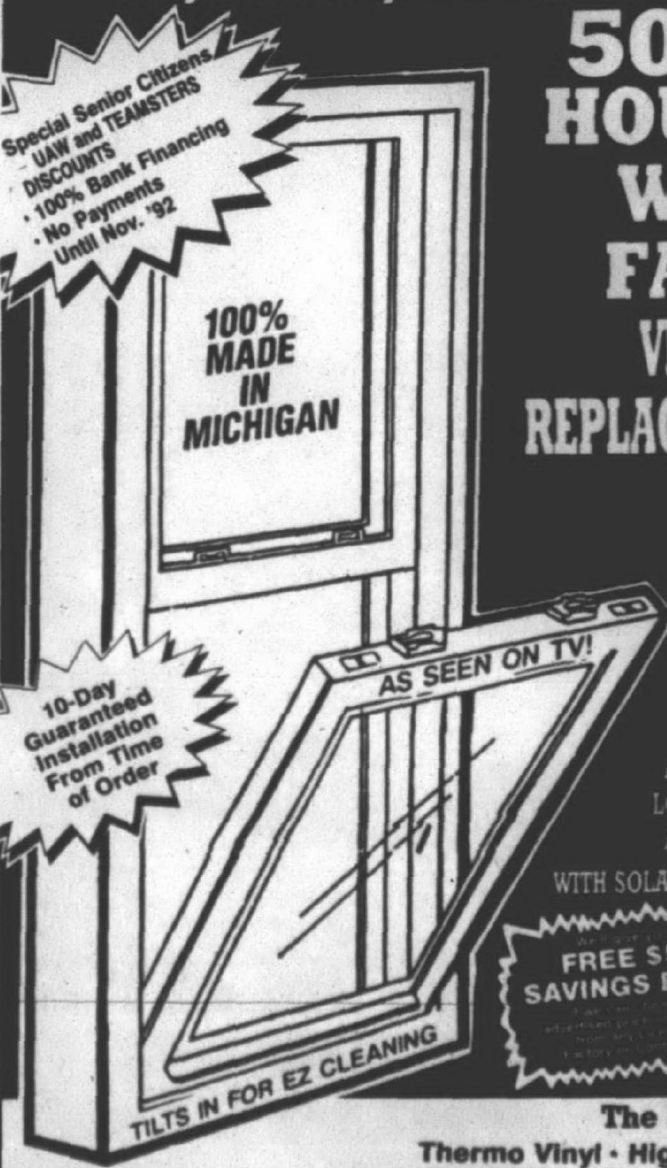

Teens learn to raise roof, fight bugs

Raising a roof in Trinidad is good work, if you don't mind the sand flies, roaches, bats, mosquitoes, geckos and other assorted critters of the untamed isle near Venezuela.

"Those (sand fly bites) were terrible bites," said 18-year-old Wendy Burkeen. "I still have the scars on my legs."

Along with 16 others from Canton's Calvary Baptist Church, Burkeen paid \$950 to spend two weeks in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago last month, working almost every day to build a roof on a dormitory building. It's all part of a program of The Evangelical Alliance of Missionaries, or TEAM, whereby teenagers from churches all over the country travel to distant lands and perform charity work.

The kids who visited Trinidad and Tobago, an island nation the size of Delaware, worked almost as hard swatting bugs as they did on the roof.

"Rhonda, Tim, Sharon and I were the only ones who didn't have mosquito nets by the time we left,"

Burkeen said.

One night Burkeen had trouble sleeping, so she turned on a light and noticed a very large unidentifiable bug just inches from where her head had been. "It was big and I was scared of it," she said. "I sat up for an hour with the light on until it ran away."

Another teen, Heather Bleau, was particularly plagued by the insects. "She had (bites) all over her arms, legs and her face," Burkeen said. "She was bitten by anything that was down there."

The junior missionaries were also visited by bats that flew through the building they stayed in and geckos that sat stoically upon the walls.

Although the teenagers and their four adult chaperones had expected merely to shingle an existing roof, they discovered upon arrival that the roof wasn't exactly existing.

All that had been constructed by the group that preceded them was a mass of poorly aligned rafters.

So the kids got down to business, straightened out the rafters, nailed down plywood and shingled the

roof. Trouble was, they kept running out of materials. "We'd run out of different things and have to pray and ask God to bring us this, bring us that," said 16-year-old Tim Simon.

Added chaperone Tammy Fontaine, "We shingled until we ran out of shingles, and that was (just) half the roof. We played a lot of

eucre while we were waiting (for materials)."

The sojourn provided an added bonus for Burkeen and Rhonda Copeland, who met their Trinidad pen pals face to face. The pen pals helped with the roof raising, but "they weren't used to work," Burkeen said. "(My pen pal) kept making comments about how hard we worked."

Mondlock carves out folksy niche

■ Buddy Mondlock could be a name dropper, rattling off an impressive list of musicians he has worked with or garnered praised from, but the folk artist prefers to let his songs speak for him.

Buddy Mondlock went to the 1986 Kerrville Folk Festival starry-eyed and a little apprehensive. Then some

people gave him a Lone Star welcome.

An aspiring folk artist was working as a festival volunteer while performing at campfires in the evening.

"She was the first person I met," said Mondlock, who performs Friday, Aug. 14, at the LaCasa Folk Music Series in Birmingham. "She took my money, handed me my ticket and gave me a big smile to get things off on a good foot."

The bearer of the friendly grin? Michelle Shocked.

But a more well-known name at the time heard Mondlock's penetrating musical prose on stage. Taken aback, the Texas songwriting statesman asked for a tape and later called the Chicagoland native to bestow a heap of praise.

Guy Clark has been raving about Buddy Mondlock since.

Mondlock could drop other names, a list of people he's worked with or peers he's received accolades from, such as Garth Brooks, Janis Ian or Townes Van Zandt. Such would only serve to distort the image of an artist whose own images are crafted so delicately in song.

Using an impressionistic blend of words and whispers, Mondlock creates landscapes that almost become greater than the numbers from which they originate.

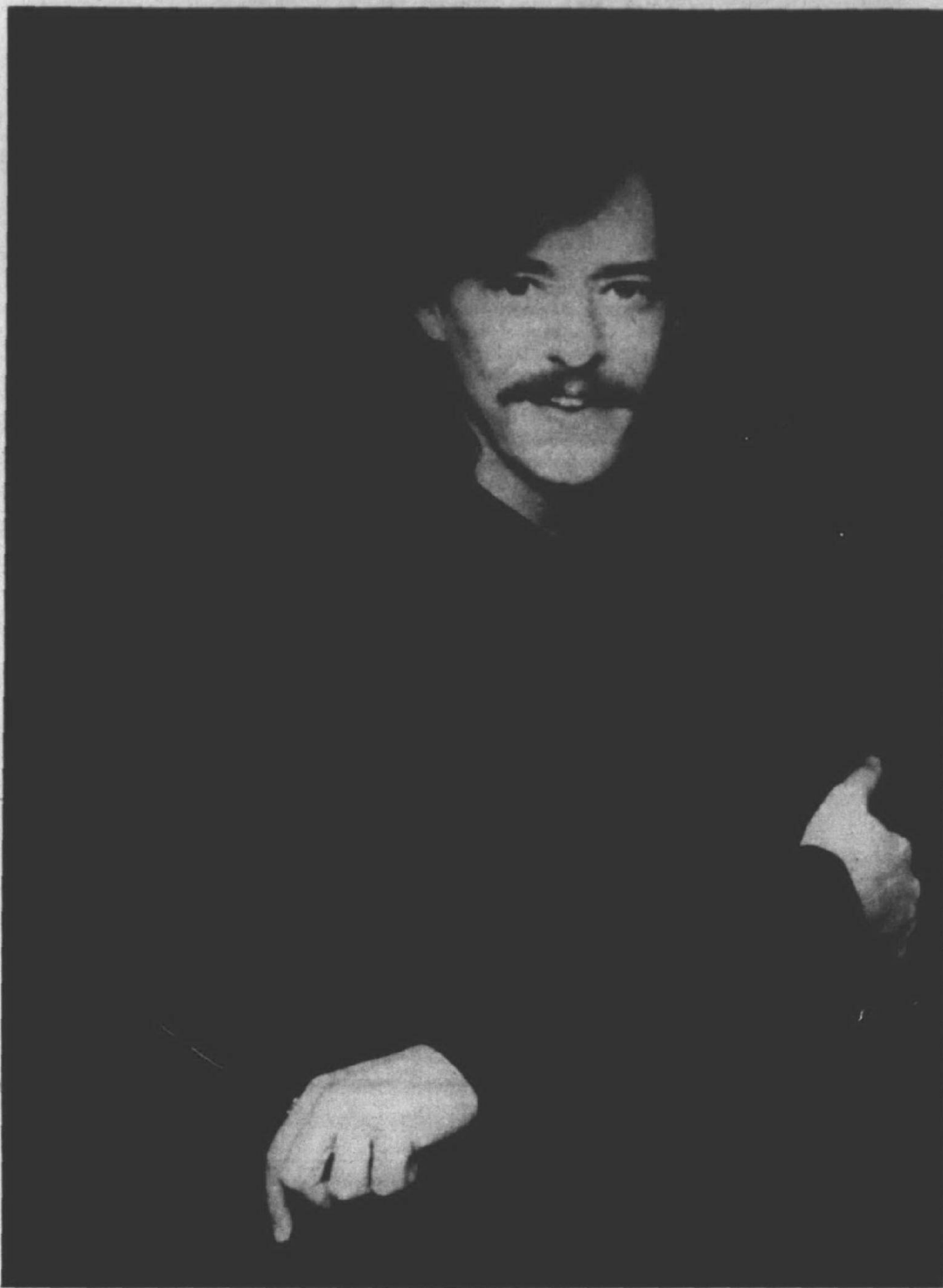
Mondlock often finds inspiration through the connection of two disparate ideas and turns songs such as "El Cerillo" and "Shelter" (a number about a suicide of a homeless person) into metaphors on frailty of the human condition.

At the core of his art, though, is a keen storyteller's eye and the ability to formulate those images into profound statements revealed in a subtle manner.

"A lot of my stuff is dark," Mondlock said, "but I don't consider myself an unhappy person. I guess it's easier to write dark songs instead of happy songs because if you write something happy you're afraid you might end up writing something that sounds corny."

His numbers have been described as anything but trite since emerging as winner of the "New Folk Award" at Kerrville Festival in 1987. He began his singer/songwriting career in Chicago, performing in the burgeoning folk scene there.

At Clark's urging, Mondlock moved to Nashville and went about releasing his own album. "On the

Line." He's busy working on a second LP.

He's also worked with Alice Randall on music for a film screenplay called "Mama Dixie." The collaboration has produced a number, "Detroit, Alabama," depicting a neighborhood of transplanted Southerners in the city.

His vast references to urban and pastoral settings is characteristic of Mondlock's well-traveled musical path. In "Amsterdam," a willowy folk number written with Janis Ian, he took a couple of wayward images and provided them with an address.

"I've been there," he said. "The song wasn't initially inspired by the

city. Janis and I were writing and the first few images that came to mind inspired the song . . . She said where is this place? Then someone said 'Amsterdam.' We both had been there and both our faces lit up."

"A lot of it (songwriting) comes from a spark — an image, a feeling or even just an emotional tone," he added. "Maybe just a few words will come out and that will be the seed."

L7 stays true to punk style

Taut, drawn to the point where one little pin-prick would send you engulfed in an inferno of rage — L7 knows the feeling all too well.

Many of the songs on the Hollywood-based outfit's Slash release "Bricks Are Heavy" are the result of being pushed to the edge. Delivered in a raw, noisy guitar and groove bass manifesto, L7 numbers such as "One More Time" and "B-tlist" aptly depict those emotions of just being plain fed up.

But the song, "Diet Pill," which revolves around a woman seeking revenge on her abusive boyfriend ("Calgon couldn't take me away from the things I've done today"), is the most definitive statement in this regard.

According to band bassist and vocalist Jennifer Finch, the number was inspired by a TV interview with country star Willie Nelson in which

he recalled how one of his old girlfriends — presumably at her breaking point — conked him on the head with a frying pan while asleep.

That explosive anger is what ferments at the core of many L7 works. "When I'm in love, walking on the beach in a happy mood, I don't write," said Finch. "When I'm pissed, I write." That's Donita's (Sparks, guitarist/vocalist) quote.

However, the song drawing the most attention in these parts is "Pretend We're Dead," which is receiving ample airplay on CIMX-FM. In the batch of heavy rockers, the languid dissonant sounding cut is the most hook ridden on the LP.

Otherwise, L7 stay true to their hardcore/punk roots. Influences? The list could leave you contorted, recalling early American punk from the Blasters and Social Distortion to the current Seattle sound crash of Mudhoney and Helmet. Some of it grooves; some of it bludgeons.

L7 formed in the void between both waves, emerging from LA's virulent hardcore scene in 1987 with a self-titled album on Epitaph Records. The band went about touring this country as well as the UK and released an EP on Sub Pop, "Smell the Magic," in 1990.

L7 has garnered its reputation solely through music. The fact it's an all-woman ensemble is made superfluous by an uncompromising grunge/groove attack.

"We have no agenda other than to play," Finch said. "We come from the hardcore scene and there were always women in that, so it's no big deal."

"It's lame because it ghettoizes us. It classifies us by gender and not by our music. I'd prefer to get off the subject, really."

Dirty 'Whispers' only makes audiences feel ill-at-ease

"Whispers in the Dark" longs to be a scary, sexy, sophisticated thriller about a high-paid New York City psychiatrist who gets too involved with her psycho clients. Sort of a "Prince of Tides" meets "Basic Instinct," you might say.

Sure, the movie dredges up all sorts of dark psychosexual fantasies through its sicko characters. But it's handled with such a supreme lack of cleverness and style that you're left feeling ill-

at-ease and questioning who this kind of nastiness is supposed to appeal to.

There is an air of pseudo-artistry here since many of Ann's patients belong to the art world. Johnny, a leather-clad young Latino, learns to redirect his sado-masochistic leanings into his art. His graphic portraits of naked women strung up like so much beef in a meat locker have made him today's art scene darling.

Eve, an attractive gallery owner, insists on stripping in front of the psychiatrist during one of their sessions. She launches into vivid detail about the mysterious man who performs kinky, dangerous sex with her while whispering in her ear.

Ann (Annabella Sciorra), meanwhile, believes she has finally found the man of her dreams in Doug (Jamey Sheridan), a sensitive pilot. When the psychiatrist decides against her better judgment to peek in on Eve and her lover during a weekly lunch date, three guesses who she finds sitting across the table.

When Eve ends up dead, the movie does successfully keep you guessing the identity of the killer. Can it really be Doug, whose sweet grey-haired mother greets Ann so lovingly on the doorstep of her Iowa home? Not very Freudian, but a definite possibility.

Alan Alda and Jill Clayburgh play husband-and-wife psychia-

trists who nurture Ann and provide a break from her bizarre life. Patients lurk in corners of her apartment building while an overly abrasive police detective plays games in the hopes of enlisting her help on the murder case.

Sciorra, so effective as the beleaguered bride in "True Love," is fairly convincing as a woman wracked by terror and manipulation. She needs better material than this trash, both written and directed with the finesse of a sledgehammer by Christopher Crowe.

By the time heroine and killer duke it out with a tire iron at the end of "Whispers in the Dark," you

can't believe that you're once again being led over such familiar slasher-movie territory.

"My Father Is Coming" also deals with the sexual subculture of New York, but it's far more entertaining and infinitely more honest. Detroiters will have to make a run for the border to get a glimpse of Monika Tret's latest, which screens this week at the Windsor Film Theatre.

When Vicki, a struggling actress, discovers that her father will soon visit from Bavaria, she enlists her gay roommate to pose as her husband. Actually, dad fits in better than she expected as he effortlessly

lands a part in the commercial she auditioned for.

His love life blossoms when she starts dating a New Age sex goddess Sprinkle. Vicki, meanwhile, struggles in a relationship with a female-to-male transsexual and wonders if she isn't the one who should high-tail it back to Germany.

Tret, best-known previously for directing "Seduction the Cruel Woman," focuses her attention on the often extreme edge of gay lifestyles. Here, with only a slightly larger budget, she adopts a kinder, gentler look at characters who are likable as well as weird.

Drug czar backs plan to abolish automatic appeals

The state's drug czar says Michigan could save \$2 million by reducing the number of automatic appeals by convicts.

Robert Peterson, coordinator of drug programs for Gov. John Engler, supports a constitutional amendment to eliminate automatic appeals by people who plead guilty.

"We should abolish the automatic right to appeal guilty pleas. Many convicts plead guilty and are not happy with the sentence," Peterson

said after testifying before a Senate subcommittee.

"We could save \$400,000 in attorneys costs, plus the cost of defense attorneys. The Supreme Court estimates the savings at \$2 million."

George Ward, chief assistant Wayne County prosecutor, agrees.

"There doesn't have to be a three-year backlog in the Court of Appeals," Ward said in a separate interview. "The Court of Appeals, by its own procedures, generates frivolous appeals. A quarter of the dock-

et is frivolous.

"Fifty-five percent of its cases are criminal. Half stem from pleas of guilty."

"Under the Michigan Constitution, a defendant has rights — the right to a jury, to witnesses, the right of appeal. The effect of a guilty plea is to waive those rights. But we have a rule that you don't waive a right in an appellate court proceeding."

"At an earlier time, they (Court of Appeals) wanted to generate a case-

load. Even if a defendant specifically waives the right to appeal, they (court) won't enforce it."

"We could still have a rule that a defendant could apply for leave to appeal if something outrageous happened."

District Judge Edward Plawecki Jr., said such a constitutional amendment "would reduce the backlog — definitely. It would take some pressure off (for new judges) and save the state attorneys' fees for indigents."

Plawecki, of Dearborn Heights, said "20 percent of appeals are frivolous — where the individual, after being fully represented, pleads guilty and waives his rights."

Appellant-convicts are entitled to file a 35-page brief and usually use the entire 35 pages. The prosecutor who sent them to prison usually uses his full 35 pages for rebuttal.

Appellant-convicts charge such irregularities as inadequate legal counsel or too stiff a sentence by the judge.

The Court of Appeals rules against all but a few appeals. But if still takes a three-judge panel — plus clerks, time and paper — to produce written opinions.

The Court of Appeals was created by the 1963 state constitution with nine judges. Today it has 24 and a three-year backlog. The Supreme Court administrator has asked for 40 judges by 1994 and said there is work for 80 judges.

Lawmakers, however, are leaning in the direction of cutting the workload by cutting automatic appeals.

Bill would allow citizens to sue drug dealers

If government can't shut down drug dealers, maybe private citizens can sue the devils out of business, says Gov. John Engler's drug czar.

"Liability laws have hurt legitimate companies," said Robert Peterson, citing how legitimate manufacturers have hesitated to develop products for fear of suits. He wants to try the lawsuit method on cocaine dealers, too.

Peterson told a Senate subcommittee in Jackson recently that allowing those who have suffered the harms of illegal drugs to sue all dealers in a market would have three effects:

"It will raise the cost of doing business.

"It will put them out of business.

"It will keep them from entering

the business."

Any dealer liable

On Engler's behalf, Peterson endorsed the novel Senate Bill 1034 providing for civil damages regardless of whether a drug dealer has been convicted criminally.

A civil suit could be filed by a drug user's parent, child or other relative. So could an employer who funds drug treatment for an addicted worker.

A "crack baby," addicted from the womb, could sue. So could the hospital that cares for the crack baby.

"Whole communities could sue," Peterson told a criminal law subcommittee headed by Sen. Jack Welborn, R-Kalamazoo.

The suit could be filed against not only the responsible dealer but

anyone in the chain of distribution and any dealer in the immediate market, he said.

"You don't have to prove the drug came from the dealer you're suing — just in the same market," Peterson said.

The successful plaintiff could collect economic damages, pain-and-suffering damages, exemplary damages and attorney fees, under Welborn's bill.

Quipped Welborn: "The trial attorneys should think I'm a good guy for opening up a whole new field for them." He has been critical of the Michigan Trial Lawyers Association for filing suits asking unlimited damages in medical liability cases.

In response to a Welborn question, Peterson said only victims — not police — could sue for damages.

Police could attempt to collect witness fees, overtime for law enforcement officers and damages from those who file false police reports.

Asked by a New Detroit spokesman to explain the mechanics of civil suits, Peterson said a civil plaintiff would have a lower threshold of proof than a county prosecutor going after the same dealer on criminal charges.

"You (civil plaintiff) are not going after them for illegally dealing drugs. You're going for damages. That's why the police can't sue. You're going after them for putting poison in the community," Peterson said, likening drug dealing to toxic pollution.

Peterson said the idea for civil suits came from the U.S. attorney in Hawaii. "We're the first state to move on this. This could be an ad-

ANKLE PAIN THAT IS NOT ARTHRITIS
Twisting an ankle is not an injury confined to the playing field. Your present life may exclude running, jumping, and sport, but you can incur an ankle sprain.

With aging you lose a nimble response to a slip, and your sinews become less resilient to a sudden twist and stretch. The ankle is the joint most vulnerable to such strain as it is a small site holding your entire weight. Furthermore, the unfettered motion of the joint depends both on the cartilage within the joint and the integrity of the ligaments on either side of the ankle bones.

An insult to ankle ligaments causes swelling and ankle pain that early in its course can be indistinguishable from sudden arthritis. Your doctor distinguishes arthritis from injury by looking for joint involvement at other sites and by examining where the most pain is in the ankle: at the joint itself or at the side.

X-rays are of slight value as they are unable to visualize tendons, and are insensitive to early changes in bone and cartilage.

Differentiating injury from arthritis is important. Ankle arthritis does best with anti-inflammatory medication that you may need for a prolonged period. In contrast, most cases of ankle injury subside on their own; rather than medication what you require is patience and an altered gait for a period of 6 weeks to 6 months.

And chances are those quaint dresses were splattered with mud in the spring and rank from the

smell of sweat in the summer.

The men often had whiskey on their breath after trips to the barn and there were too many funerals for children.

We've done a fine job of preserving the graceful buildings of the 19th century and the tools, but a rotten job of telling the real story of how people lived.

There was a reason people left the farms for an easier job in the city, where there was running water and something to do at night.

It's time to put a few smudge marks on our historical exhibits.

ROLL CALL REPORT

Sander Levin says no to full House post office disclosure

Here's how Observer & Eccentric-area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes in the week ending July 24.

HOUSE

No for public disclosure of post office scandal: By a vote of 223 for and 196 against, the House killed a proposal (H Res 526) for full public disclosure of transcripts that underpin a task force finding of employee misconduct at the House Post Office. These and other files from the largely secret congressional probe are being referred to the Justice Department and the House Ethics Committee.

Republicans called for disclosure, while Democrats, who have received most of the blame for problems at the post office that they control, largely opposed the measure.

"We have nothing to hide," said Charlie Rose, D-N.C., who voted to kill the resolution. He pointed out that no House member has been accused of corrupt activity in the matter.

Robert Walker, R-Pa., objected to the Democrats' "behind closed doors" treatment of the post office scandal, saying "the American public wants us to open up to them."

A yes vote opposed disclosure of witness transcripts from the post office probe. **Area representatives voting yes were: Dennis Hertel, D-Harper Woods, William Ford, D-Taylor, Sander Levin, D-Southfield. Voting no were: Carl Pursell, R-**

Plymouth, William Broomfield, R-Birmingham.

Yes to raise grazing fees: By a vote of 164 for and 245 against, the House refused to kill a proposed hike in fees the government charges western ranchers for cattle grazing on federal land. This preserved sharply higher charges as part of the fiscal 1993 Interior Department appropriations bill (HR 5503). Fees would rise over four years from the present taxpayer-subsidized level of nearly \$2.00 monthly per animal unit to \$5.36.

Pat Williams, D-Mont., voted to kill the hike because, he said, "it is going to drive marginal cattle operators off the land."

Chester Atkins, D-Mass., asked foes of the increase, "How can you be aggressively for a balanced budget amendment but then want the big subsidies for the big operators in your district?"

A yes vote opposed higher public grazing fees for western ranchers. **Area representatives voting yes were: Pursell. Voting no were: Hertel, William Ford, Sander Levin, Broomfield.**

Yes to regulate cable TV: By a vote of 340 for and 73 against, the House sent to conference with the Senate a bill (HR 485) to reinstate federal regulation of cable television. It empowers the FCC to control rates charged by the nation's 11,000-plus cable systems, set customer service standards,

open up monopolistic programming practices and prohibits exclusive operating franchises. Local authorities would enforce the FCC standards.

Supporter John Dingell, D-Mich., said "millions of cable subscribers have been subjected to rate increases that never seem to end. Customer service is poor or nonexistent."

Opponent Thomas Bliley, R-Va., said the bill is "over-regulatory in every respect" and "will result in higher, yes, higher rather than lower cable bills."

A yes vote was to pass the bill. **Area representatives voting yes were: Hertel, William Ford, Sander Levin, Broomfield. Voting no was: Pursell.**

SENATE

Yes to bar out-of-state trash: By a vote of 89 for and two against, the Senate passed a bill (S 2877) allowing states to restrict municipal waste imports from other states.

Governors could ban or limit out-of-state trash on written request from their local governments. States could freeze waste imports at 1991 or 1992 levels, whichever is less. The bill overcomes the constitutional ban on states restricting interstate commerce unless authorized to do so by Congress.

Supporter Max Baucus, D-Mont., said "no state should be forced to take another state's trash because the exporting state doesn't have the political will to deal with its own waste."


No opponent spoke against the bill.

A yes vote was to pass the bill. **Michigan Senators Carol Levin, D, and Donald Riegla, D, voted yes.**

Yes on community control issue: By a vote of 60 for

and 31 against, the Senate tabled (killed) an amendment to S 2877 (above) restricting the right of local governments to accept out-of-state trash. The amendment sought to permit governors to ban imports

without receiving a community's request to do so. A yes vote was to bolster the power of communities to accept out-of-state trash. **Sens. Levin and Riegla voted no.**

Ripe summer melons melt in your mouth

"It is almost sacrilegious to do anything more with a small ripe melon than to eat it with a silver spoon," wrote Marion Harland in 1897 in her book "Breakfast, Luncheon and Tea." Although I do appreciate exquisite tastes, I'm not really into polishing the family silver just to sit down and enjoy what is turning out to be another bumper year for the melon industry. Thanks to an unusually rainy summer, Michigan melons should be peaking very soon.

The aroma of fresh melons is almost intoxicating. A recent trip to Eastern Market found vendors who were offering a sample slice of their delicious ripe melons to passerby. It was a royal refreshment under the steamy midday sun.

Nowadays, there are a greater variety of melons available in this country than anywhere else in the world. With modern refrigeration and storage techniques and the ability to get the melons to markets with great haste, melt-in-your-mouth juiciness is a check-out lane away.

Melon history

So how did we happen to stumble on this glorious tidbit of nature? Believe it or not, the melon is an ancient fruit. The oldest European cookery book, written by the great Roman gourmet Apicius in the first century, gives his recipe for melon with honey dressing.

That melon was probably the forerunner of what we call the muskmelon, a large genus whose familiar members today include cantaloupes, crenshaws, honeydews and Persians. Both the muskmelon and the watermelon are believed to have originated in Africa.

To judge quality in all melons, look for symmetry in shape and uniformity in color. A melon that is flattened on one side may be underdeveloped — not only its shape, but also in its texture and flavor, which may be under par.

Checking ripeness

Avoid any melon that feels soft and mushy when pressed or shows bruises, dark spots, cracks or withered skin. Ripeness is the most important characteristic to look for in melons and is best revealed by the characteristic warm, flowery aroma detectable when one sniffs the skin. The blossom end of a ripe melon should yield to the touch without being mushy.

Cantaloupes are the most popular melon and are available mainly from May through October. The lovely orange color and mellow taste make it a favorite for cooking and vibrant desserts. For the uninitiated, Howell is the melon capital of Michigan and many say that a fresh Howell cantaloupe is nothing short of heavenly all by itself.

For a unique appetizer, I like to serve fresh Howell melons wrapped in a paper-thin slices of prosciutto and a sprinkling of black pepper. For a good muskmelon, pick a firm and heavy melon with a distinctive, sweet aroma. Among the muskmelons, honeydew is second to the cantaloupe both in popularity and abundance. The season runs from June to October.

Ripeness is easiest to judge in the honeydew; unripe melons will be greenish, with little aroma and wax. As the melons ripen, the skin takes on a white, waxy finish. Ripe honeydews will be tender at the blossom and have a distinct aroma. The best will have a skin the color of light butter. Honeydews are best mixed with other fruits (in salads) and they will make a superb complement to poultry or fish.

Unusual melons

Persian melons look very much like cantaloupes but are slightly larger with a more finely textured rind. Available in the west from July to October, they are mainly sighted in our area in August, September and early October. They are well worth looking for, as their perfect texture and flavor make them prime candidates for eating just as Mrs. Harland described, with only a spoon.

The Crenshaw is, to my own personal taste, the queen of melons. The intense bright, buttercup yellow of their rough rind is a sure sign of ripeness. Like Persian melons, the best Crenshaws can be had from August to September in our area.

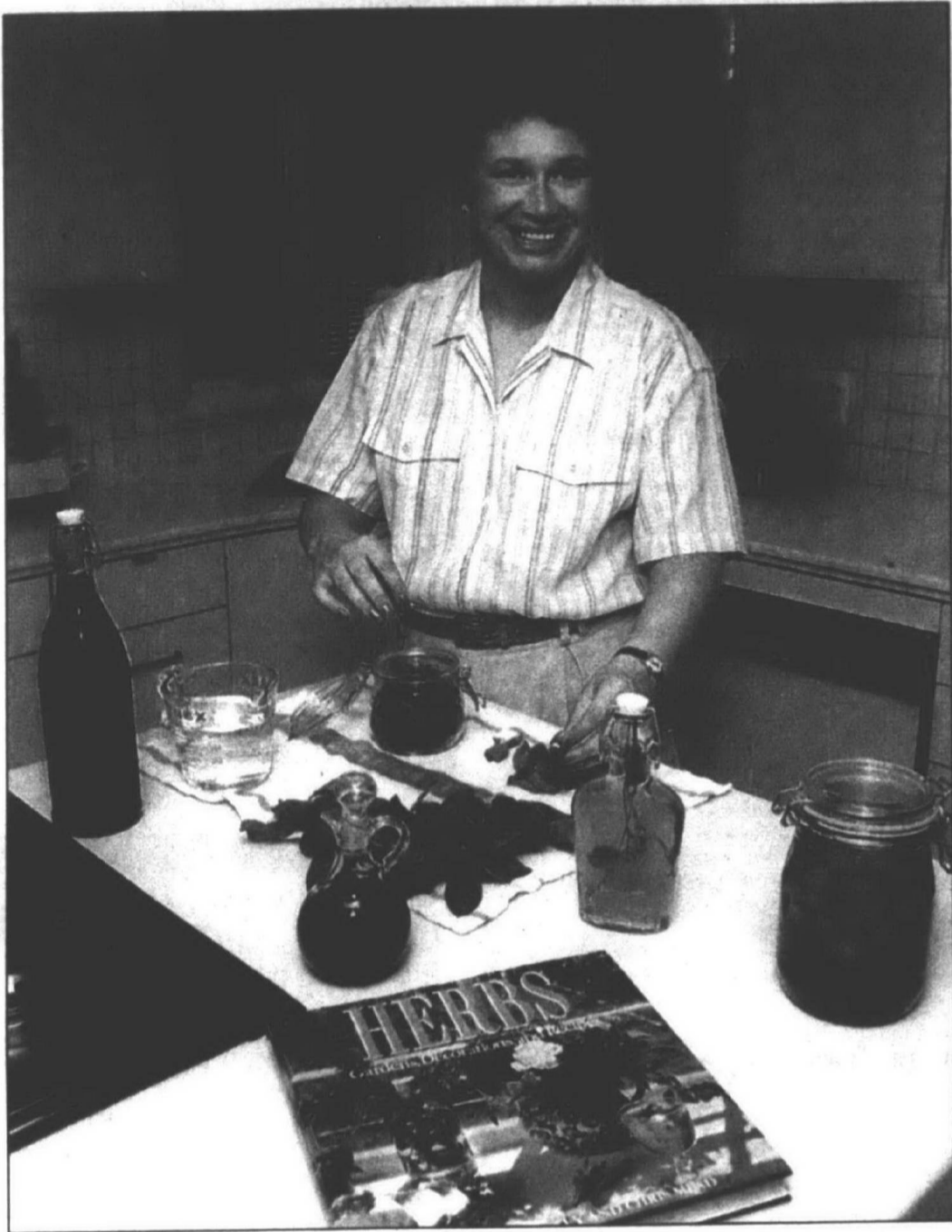
Watermelons are by far one of the most abundant and popular melons available in every market. What would summer be like without this refreshing fruit? There are many varieties, from round to oval with green or striped rinds and white, yellow or red flesh. Look for firm, juicy flesh with a good bright color and avoid melons with a pale dry or mealy flesh. After the fruit has been eaten, save the rind for chutneys and preserves!

Chinese winter melon is available all year because the fall harvest can be stored for use in the winter and spring.

Summer in a bottle

Create your own flavored vinegars

Vinegar isn't just for making pickles. Herb and fruit flavored vinegars add zest, not calories to meats, vegetables and salads.

Among the remnants of the short-lived nouvelle cuisine era, flavored vinegars continue to grow in popularity. As one of the world's oldest flavoring staples, vinegars are no longer reserved just for canning, pickling and dressing salads.

Sauteed or grilled poultry, meats and vegetables become rejuvenated with a splash of berry or herb flavored vinegar. They add a bit of zest and leave your palate refreshed without adding fat or calories to a fruit or vegetable salad.

Berry vinegars such as strawberry, blueberry or black raspberry and herb vinegars made with tarragon, dill or a bouquet of Provencal herbs are simple to prepare. They can be packaged in decorative cut glass bottles to be given as gifts which one would assume you slaved over for weeks.

The process requires very little. Fresh berries or herbs are infused with heated vinegar. The infusion is then left to steep. A few days later it is strained into sterilized bottles and viola!

Diane Schrift of Birmingham fell in love with homemade vinaigrettes and flavored vinegars while studying classic French cuisine at La Varenne cooking school near Paris.

Every summer she prepares a variety of berry flavored and herb vinegars after harvesting wild black and red raspberries and herbs from her garden. "These are great to have on hand in the winter when no one has access to fresh herbs and fruits," she said.

This summer Schrift infused seven different flavored vinegars to keep on her pantry shelf to use throughout the year and to give as gifts. She recommends using distilled white vinegar for all the berry vinegars because the berry juices will dilute the base resulting in a full-bodied vinegar.

When preparing tarragon vinegar, she generally uses a cider vinegar as the apple cider flavor blends nicely with tarragon. Her "garden vinegar" is made with white wine vinegar, oregano, sage, thyme, mustard seed, and a few cloves of garlic.

Shirley Siegel of Troy has been making flavored vinegars for about five years and recently taught a class in Troy. Siegel is a stickler when it comes to sterilization equipment and follows through with the selection of her ingredients. She stresses using fresh fruit at the peak of perfection. "You can't use anything else if you want a pure vinegar to last."

Serve this delicious Armenian dish with a fresh fruit salad. Take your pick from the wide selection available — melons, berries, nectarines, etc.

Serve them by themselves or on top of vanilla yogurt, or combine them in a colorful fresh fruit salad.

STUFFED SUMMER VEGETABLES (DOLMA)

- 1 pound lean ground beef or lamb
- 1 large onion, chopped fine
- ¾ cup uncooked rice
- ½ bunch (½-cup) fresh parsley, chopped fine
- ¼ cup fresh dill, chopped fine
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 4 green or red peppers
- 2-3 medium zucchinis
- 4-5 medium tomatoes
- 1 can chicken broth or stock, 15 ounce size
- ½ fresh lemon, squeezed and strained
- 2 tablespoons tomato sauce or puree
- Plain yogurt, 16 ounce size
- 2-3 garlic cloves, crushed

Cut off the tops of the green peppers and tomatoes and reserve for lids.

Core peppers. Scoop out insides of tomatoes and chop reserve pulp.

Core out zucchini pulp, leaving a shell.

In a large bowl, combine beef, onion, rice, reserved tomato pulp, parsley, dill garlic and seasonings. Knead until ingredients are blended.

Heat the broth, tomato sauce and lemon juice in a small saucepan. Stuff the vegetables and place in a 9 by 13 baking dish. Pour the broth in the dish ¼ inch deep.

Cover with aluminum foil and bake at 350 degrees for 1 to 1½ hours until the vegetables are tender and the rice is cooked.

Serve with plain yogurt on the side, or for an extra taste treat, add two or three (or to taste) additional crushed garlic cloves to the plain yogurt. Serves 6.

PITA CRISPS

- 3-4 rounds pita bread, separated into halves
- margarine or butter
- Parmesan cheese
- Garlic powder to taste

Open up three to four rounds of pita bread. Spread a little margarine or butter on the inside of each half.

Sprinkle with a little Parmesan cheese and garlic powder to taste. Broil until golden brown and bubbly.

WATERMELON RIND CHUTNEY

3 quarts chopped, pared white watermelon rind
 2 tablespoons non-iodized salt
 3 cups cored, chopped baking apples
 2 cups chopped onions
 2 tablespoons non-iodized salt
 1 quart white vinegar
 2 tablespoons mustard seed
 2 teaspoons celery seed
 3 cloves garlic
 15 ounces golden raisins
 2 cups packed brown sugar
 1 cup sugar
 1 (5-oz.) jar preserved ginger, chopped
 1 lemon, sliced
 1/2 cup lemon juice
 2 teaspoons cinnamon
 2 teaspoons ground cloves
 2 teaspoons ground allspice
 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper

Heat rind and 2 tablespoons salt in water to cover in a large kettle. Heat to boiling, reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes. Drain.
 Combine rind, apples, onions, 2 table-

spoons salt and vinegar in a large bowl. Let stand at room temperature for three hours. Drain, reserve rind mixture and liquid separately.

Crush mustard and celery seeds and garlic cloves. Heat reserved vinegar, crushed herb mixture and remaining ingredients except rind mixture in large kettle over medium heat, stirring frequently. Stir in reserved rind mixture, simmer stirring occasionally until syrup thickens, about one hour. Taste and adjust seasonings. Let stand at room temp overnight.

Heat mixture to boiling, follow canning procedures and leave 1/4 inch headspace in jars. Process in a boiling water bath for 10 minutes. Makes about five pints

MELON AND ORANGE SALAD

3 quarts honeydew melon balls
 3/4 cup orange juice
 1/4 cup orange flavored liqueur
 2 tablespoons sugar
 2 teaspoons fresh grated orange peel
 fresh berries
 fresh mint sprigs

Combine all ingredients except berries and mint in serving bowl and toss gently. Refrigerate covered for about 4 hours. Garnish with berries and fresh mint. Serve

at room temperature. Serves 8.

WINTERMELON AND HAM SOUP

2 pounds wintermelon, seeds removed, pared
 6 cups chicken broth
 1 cup fresh chopped country style ham
 fresh ground white pepper

Heat melon slices in water to cover in uncovered kettle to boiling. Reduce heat, simmer melon for 15 minutes. Drain, rinse with cold water, slice melon into julienne strips. Heat chicken broth, ham and melon in kettle just until hot. Do not boil. Sprinkle with fresh ground white pepper.

MELON WITH RASPBERRY SAUCE

2 quarts cantaloupe balls
 1/4 cup lemon juice
 2 tablespoons sugar
 1 package (10 oz.) frozen raspberries in syrup, thawed
 1/4 cup cream de cassis, optional
 4 small cantaloupes, cut into halves

Combine melon balls, lemon juice and sugar in a bowl. Place thawed berries in a

blender and blend until smooth. Strain, discard seeds. Stir in cream de cassis. Combine raspberry and cantaloupe mixtures. Spoon 2 cups into each melon half. Garnish with mint or whipped cream. Serves 8.

PICKLED MELON RIND

4 tablespoons non-iodized salt
 2 quarts water
 2 quarts white rind, cut into cubes
 8 cups packed brown sugar
 1 quart water
 2 lemons, sliced into rounds
 1 teaspoon ground ginger

Dissolve salt into the water, soak rind in the salt solution for 8 hours or overnight. Drain rind, soak in ice water to cover for 2 hours. Drain, pat dry. Stir brown sugar into 1 quart water and place over low heat to dissolve. Add rind, cook until rind is tender but not soft, about 10 minutes. Remove rind, pack into 4 sterilized jars. Add lemon slices and ginger to syrup; cook until syrup is thick and registers 222 degrees on a candy thermometer. Pour the hot syrup over the rind and follow canning procedures. Process in a boiling water bath for 10 minutes.

Ice cream, mint top strawberries

AP — Here's an elegant summer dessert that takes only five ingredients — and just minutes to prepare. Chocolate fudge ice cream is the topper for fresh strawberries, flavored with a hint of mint and Burgundy wine.

Burgundy Strawberries is the creation of chef Michel Richard of Citrus in Los Angeles. "When I developed this recipe, my goal was to show that a sophisticated dish doesn't have to be complicated or time-consuming," Richard said.

BURGUNDY STRAWBERRIES

4 ounces Burgundy wine
 3 tablespoons sugar
 10 chopped mint leaves
 1 pint strawberries, cut in pieces
 1 quart chocolate fudge ice cream

In medium bowl, mix wine and sugar. Add mint leaves, then pour over strawberries. Let marinate 3 hours. Serve strawberries in four individual shallow bowls; top with chocolate fudge ice cream. Makes 4 servings.

MIXED HERB VINEGAR

4 cups white wine vinegar or cider vinegar
 1 five inch fresh sprig of thyme, free of blemishes
 1 five inch fresh sprig of tarragon
 3 peeled garlic cloves
 3 allspice berries
 3 black peppercorns
 1/2 small bay leaf

Place herbs in a French canning jar fitted with a spring top lid. Cover with vinegar. Allow to set on kitchen counter for 5 days. Swirl mixture every few days. When desired flavor is achieved, pour into sterilized bottles with spring top lids. Store on cool dark shelf.

BERRY VINEGAR

4 cups distilled white or white wine vinegar
 1 cup ripe fresh unblemished or frozen strawberries, raspberries, blueberries, blackberries, cherries, black raspberries or gooseberries
 2 tablespoons sugar, optional

In a non-corrosive saucepan mix together berries and vinegar. Heat mixture until it simmers. Add sugar if desired, stirring until dissolved.

Pour mixture into a sterilized glass jar. Cool to room temperature, then cover with plastic wrap then the lid.

Allow mixture to steep 3 to 5 days at room temperature. Pour into a metal strainer or funnel with a paper coffee filter. Discard fruit. Pour vinegar into a sterilized glass bottles fitted with a spring-stopper top. Store vinegar in a cool dark place.

INSALATA DI MOZZARELLA

4 red peppers, quartered, cored, seeded, roasted
 3/4 lb. fresh mozzarella or fontina cheese cut into slices 1/2 inch thick
 1 small head bibb lettuce
 Vinaigrette:
 6 Tablespoons light French or Italian Olive oil
 2 Tablespoons basil flavored wine vinegar
 1 1/2 Tablespoons fresh, snipped basil leaves
 1 teaspoon anchovy paste, or to taste salt, if desired

Mix vinaigrette in jar or blender and refrigerate until serving. Arrange leaves of lettuce on individual salad plates. Alternate pepper slices with the cheese. Shake dressing and pour over each salad at serving. Garnish with Italian parsley leaves and black olives.

Try these easy tips for making interesting, flavored vinegars

Here are some helpful tips about making flavored vinegars from Diane Schrift and Shirley Siegel.

When asked about using champagne vinegar as a base, Schrift answered "people get esoteric about these. Unless you're tasting these straight or in a simple vinaigrette you can't tell the difference."

Schrift recommends mixing berries with vinegar in a saucepan until the mixture simmers. Remove mixture and pour into sterilized jars. Cover and allow to sit for three to five days on the kitchen counter before filtering through a paper coffee filter and packing into sterilized glass bottles.

Two of Siegel's favorite flavor combinations are strawberries, cinnamon stick and lemon zest to be used in salads, and a versatile tarragon vinegar flavored with dired chili pepper, peeled garlic cloves and a few black peppercorns.

Siegel suggests mixing the berry vinegars with mayonnaise or sour cream when making fruit salads or using the herb/pepper vinegars in vinaigrettes or for marinating meats before grilling.

Schrift and Siegel avoid storing their homemade vinegars in bottles with cork tops. They prefer those with wire spring tops or simply use canning jars.

If you'd like to sample a few commercial flavored vinegars before experimenting on your own, the Rothschild Berry Farm flavored vinegars are highly recommended. Located in Urbana, Ohio, they began producing vinegars in 1985. Their vinegars are made in small batches, all by hand with a white wine vinegar base. Look for them in the pantry shop at Hudson's, at the Merchant of Vino in Birmingham, Southfield and Troy, and at Keith Famie's Les Saisons in Royal Oak.

Have you ever wondered if some of the leftover food in your refrigerator is safe to eat? Or, have you been puzzled over directions in a recipe? Or what's safe to take to a picnic?

"Ponder no more," said Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service.

The Food and Nutrition Hotline is ready and willing to answer all of your food-related questions. "We are all ready with the very latest USDA recommendations," said Treitman. So if you haven't 'canned' for a while and are unsure of what to do, just give them a call 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday at 858-0904.

Cookie lovers! After much clamoring for her secret recipes, Debbi Fields, originator of Mrs. Fields cookies, has written "Mrs. Fields Cookie Book: 100 Recipes from the Kitchen of Mrs. Fields," (Time-Life Books Inc.; August 1992, \$12.95, paperback; color photographs throughout).

Since opening her first sweet shop 15 years ago in California, Mrs. Fields cookies have become the favorite of kids and adults. Today there are more than 500 stores around the world.

The recipes were tested in Fields' home kitchen and given the sweet tooth seal of approval by her five young daughters. "My daughters made the final selections. If they did not love a recipe, we did not include it."

I loved the how-to pictures that show you how to mix and roll the dough. I don't know about you, but my cookies seldom turn out looking like the pictures in the cookbook. The pictures were a big help.

Here's a recipe from the book.

MARBLES

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup light brown sugar, firmly packed
- ½ cup white sugar
- ½ cup salted butter, softened
- 1 large egg
- ½ cup (4 oz.) sour cream
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 cup (6 oz.) semisweet chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 300 degrees. In medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder and salt with wire whisk. Set aside.

Combine sugars in a large bowl using an electric mixer set at medium speed. Add butter

and beat until batter is grainy. Add egg, sour cream and vanilla, and beat at medium speed until light and fluffy. Scrape bowl. Add the flour mixture, and blend at low speed until just combined. Do not overmix.

Place chocolate chips in double boiler over hot but not boiling water. Stir constantly until melted. Or, place chips in a microwave-proof bowl and microwave on high, stirring every 20 seconds until melted.

Cool chocolate for a few minutes and pour over cookie batter. Using a wooden spoon or rubber spatula, lightly fold melted chocolate into the dough. Do not mix chocolate completely into cookie dough.

Drop by rounded tablespoons, 2 inches apart, onto ungreased cookie sheets. Bake 23-25 minutes. Do not brown. Quickly transfer cookies to a cool surface. Yield 2½ dozen.

Betty Crocker tip of the week: Leeks can be used in place of onions for scallions. Cut away root at the bottom and remove dry outer skin and blemished leaves, then rinse inside well to remove sand. The bulb at the root end can be used, but they are slightly tough — better for soups and baked dishes than for salads.

Leeks can be frozen, as can onions and scallions. Simply clean and chop them before sealing in freezer-proof containers.

Simmer in water to slice pilaf fat

AP — An easy way to reduce the fat in pilaf recipes is to skip the usual step of sauteing the vegetables and grain. Instead, simmer these ingredients in water.

This particular fiber-rich pilaf features kashi, a seven-grain pilaf mix that provides more fiber than rice. (Fiber, when eaten along with a low-fat diet, may help to reduce your risk of heart disease and cancer.) Look for kashi in the rice and grain section of your grocery store or use the recipe for 3-Grain Pilaf below.

SEVEN-GRAIN PILAF AND VEGETABLES

- One 6½-ounce packet kashi (½ of a 19 recipe 3-Grain Pilaf)
- 2 medium zucchini, sliced (2 cups)
- 1 medium yellow summer squash, sliced (1 cup)
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 medium green pepper, cut into strips (1 cup)
- One 8-ounce can tomato sauce
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- ¼ teaspoon dried basil, crushed
- 1 large tomato, sliced
- ¼ cup shredded Cheddar cheese (2 ounces)

Prepare kashi according to package directions, using 2 cups water for the liquid. Or, prepare 3-Grain Pilaf. In another saucepan cook zucchini, squash, onion and green pepper, covered, in a small amount of boiling water for 2 to 3 minutes or until barely crisp-tender; drain.

Spread kashi in the bottom of a lightly greased 10-by-6-by-2-inch baking dish. Top with zucchini mixture. Stir together tomato sauce, garlic and basil; pour over zucchini mixture. Top with tomato slices. Bake, covered, in a 325-degree F oven for 25 minutes or until heated through. Sprinkle with cheese; bake, uncovered, for 5 minutes more or until cheese is melted. Makes 8 servings.

3-Grain Pilaf: In a medium saucepan combine 1½ cups water, ½ cup wheat berries and ¼ teaspoon salt. Cover and chill overnight. Add ¼ cup brown rice. Simmer, covered, for 20 minutes. Add 1½ cup quick-cooking barley. Cook for 10 to 15 minutes more or until rice is tender and water is al-

most absorbed. Remove from heat; let stand, covered, for 10 minutes.

Somehow summer is the best season to observe Aspen functioning as a wholesome little town, not just as a resort driven by skiing.

People do simple, free things: Residents bike to and from work; they play in the parks and older children safely roam the pedestrian mall on their own. So much of what happens in summer occurs beneath one tent or another, but the performances and lectures account for only a portion of Aspen's magnetism.

Along with the town's brimming art and cultural fare, it is Aspen's unadorned outdoor beauty that draws ever more devotees.

Few vistas are as gratifying or as easy to reach as the one at the end of the short bus trip from Aspen's Rubey Park Transport Center to Maroon Lake.

From the lake one can tackle a number of hikes of varying difficulty into the back country. Meanwhile, it seems mountain and road biking threaten to overtake hiking in popularity.

After so much daytime exertion, therefore, it is a wonder anyone has the energy to attend a dance concert, a free lecture at the Aspen Institute, a performance at the venerable Aspen Music Festival or any of the many other entertainments.

Yet they do, although the evening pace slows imperceptibly as the night air cools. After dinner and a concert, the day's last activity is often a gentle mall crawl on Hyman Avenue.

Street performers abound and the sidewalks are full of people well into the night. Some shops stay

open until 10 p.m. or later — the collegial Explore Booksellers and Coffeehouse at 221 E. Main St. is open until midnight in summer and abuzz with browsers.

Dance, music and theater

After 22 summers of performing in the Aspen High School Gymnasium, the DanceAspen festival now commands a state-of-the-art stage in a handsome new 548-seat auditorium at the Aspen Elementary School, a space designed to accommodate any visiting dance troupe.

DanceAspen features seven companies at its new location. Miami City Ballet will perform on Aug. 10, Hubbard Street Dance Company on Aug. 13. Tickets for the festival, which will run through Aug. 22, cost from \$5 for matinees to \$30 for evening performances. Tickets can be ordered by phone (800-933-3820), or in writing to DanceAspen, P.O. Box 8745, Aspen, Colo. 81612.

The Aspen Music Festival, in its 44th year, will run to Aug. 23. More than 130 events are presented every summer, including orchestral, chamber, opera, choral, jazz and master classes.

Stockholm shop caters to beer buffs

In Stockholm a glass of beer is relatively expensive. It costs about \$8.

A more economical activity for beer lovers may be a trip to the shop called Ol

Kompaniet.

This small, well-designed space — around the corner from the Royal Dramatic Theater — specializes in beer-theme products.

That includes beer glasses from about 200 of the world's most famous and obscure breweries.

There are also beer-theme place mats, postcards, bottle openers and posters — as well as all the ingredients for making home-brewed beer.

"Beer has become more popular than ever," said Maria Nordlof, co-owner of the shop.

"It's cheaper for us than alcohol and wine. And Swedes have traveled abroad and sampled beers everywhere. Especially women. Over half of our customers are women buying things for themselves or for their husbands or boyfriends.

"You know it's always difficult to buy for a man. But beer things — they love them."

Nordlof opened the shop in November 1990 with her cousin Peter Nordov. The reason was simple:

"I like beer," Nordlof says, as she samples a new non-alcoholic beer sent by a local brewer.

But in this shop a traveler soon learns all beer glasses are not the same. Some are tall and graceful, others short and fat. Some must be held in two hands; the delicate, fine

crystal ones can be pinched in two fingers.

Most of the glasses carry a specific brewer's name and logo.

"It's not been easy to acquire these glasses. Pubs get them for free, but they are rarely sold to anyone," says Nordlof about brewers' customs for selling their glasses to the public.

Ol Kompaniet has exquisite hand-blown "bryggarglas," which are manufactured by the famed Swedish glassmaker Reijmyre. These are used in the Opera Bar, Stockholm's choice night spot. They sell for about \$40 each.

The store also sells glasses from several breweries in Belgium: from the Lindemans Kriek brewery for about \$8.40 each, and from Duvel for about \$14.50 each and from Duvel for about \$12.60 each.

There are Newcastle Brown Ale

glasses from England for about \$8.20 each, Samuel Adams glasses from America for about \$8.90 each, Murphy's Stout glasses from Ireland for about \$8.20 each.

"You should drink beer out of whatever kind of glass you like," says Nordlof, in an egalitarian spirit that is characteristic of beer drinkers.

"When I went to England and had my first glass of English beer in a standard English pint glass I thought, 'At last, I have found my real beer glass.'"

Indeed, Nordlof can barely keep pint glasses, priced at about \$5.30 each, in stock.

But on the negative side, four of their games ended in ties — which, fittingly, tied an NCAA record.

Another negative: CMU did not make a return trip to the Cal Bowl. And there are no bowls for the Mid-American Conference's runner-up.

But the biggest positive came in a non-league game last Sept. 14. The Chips were in East Lansing that day, and they recorded one of the season's biggest upsets, beating Michigan State 20-3.

It was, to say the least, a thrill. "It gave me a big thrill just playing there," said Tim Wojcik, the Chips' fullback from Redford (St. Agatha). "By the time the warm-up was over, I was out of breath."

The experience of winning in Spartan Stadium was something no Chip will forget. "It's right up there," admitted Bryant Satterlee, the Westland John Glenn grad who's slated to start at inside linebacker for CMU.

Part of the satisfaction came from friendships. As Mike Nettie, the Chips' all-MAC defensive tackle from Livonia (Stevenson), explained, there are a lot of people on both sides of the ball who know each other well.

Starting for MSU on the offensive line are Jeff Graham, from John Glenn, and Toby Heaton, from Plymouth (Redford Catholic Central). Nettie spent a lot of time with Heaton working out this summer.

But the conversation between weightlifting sets never led to goading. "I'm not into that, adding fuel to the fire," said Nettie.

Satterlee and Wojcik agreed. "I'm not going to rub it in," said Satterlee, who together with CMU teammate Chris Scheffer played with Graham at Glenn. He knows the Chips have a return engagement at MSU Sept. 12. "They'll be ready for us this year."

Wojcik added: "This will be a grudge match."

But CMU has other concerns entering the '92 campaign. Graduated are starting quarterback Jeff Bender (1,754 yards passing, 11 touchdowns) and the MAC's leading rusher, tailback Billy Smith (1,440 yards). Those holes won't easily be filled.

Wojcik hopes he can partially fill one of them. Although he started all 11 games last year at fullback, he carried the ball just 11 times (for 24 yards). "That's what the fullback does at Central," he said. "Block."

At 6-foot-1 and 215 pounds, Wojcik is a bit small for that role. But CMU coach Herb Deromedi has nothing but praise for his junior fullback, calling him one of the team's most underrated players.

Actually, Wojcik doesn't mind his role. "To tell the truth, I love it," he said. "It's like playing linebacker on offense — you get to hit people."

Now he'd like to do the same thing with the ball. "Nettie told me to forget making moves and just hit people," said Wojcik.

The 6-2, 230-pound Satterlee, a fourth-year junior, is happy to get his shot at starting. And he knows what's expected of him. "Our defense is designed for the linebackers to make the play and the defensive linemen to clear the way for us," he said. "And we have an excellent defensive line."

Nettie (6-3, 275) is a big part of it. As a junior, he recorded nine sacks and 84 tackles. Scheffer (6-0, 270) played in every game last season, finishing with 27 tackles, three of them for losses.

mer hockey, so it's wheel and deal. We knew it was going to be a wide-open game, and we wanted to get behind them with the extra pass and go for the bomb."

"Our defensemen — and it has worked so well — get into the flow of the offense, and it's like having four forwards and one defenseman," Baker said. "It was too easy for two or three of their guys to beat one of our defensemen."

Outlook: Coach Tom Lichtenberg thinks that after two poor seasons (only three wins), the Bobcats should turn it around this year. With leading rusher Tim Curtis (1,085 yards) and quarterback Tom Dubs (1,855 yards) back, together with four of the top five tacklers on defense, he could be right. OU might have its first winning season in 10 years.

Toledo

Last year's finish: 5-5-1 overall, 4-3-1 in the MAC.

Local players: None.

Returning starters: Five offensive, seven defensive, plus the placekicker and punter.

Outlook: Speed and quickness are coach Gary Prater's biggest concerns. So are his inebackers, where Darrell Mossburg is the only returnee with experience. Quarterback Kevin Meger threw for 1,787 yards, but had 13 interceptions and just six TDs. Playing Central Michigan, Western Michigan, Bowling Green, Miami and Ball State in a six-week span won't help.

Western Michigan

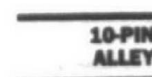
Last year's finish: 6-5 overall, 4-4 in the MAC.

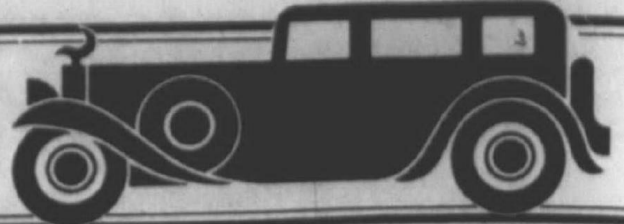



Roc' begins second season

on the air — live

Series' outspoken star seeks greater challenge

Broadcast networks can be difficult to characterize. Last year, CBS was No. 3, now it's No. 1. Once proud as a peacock, General Electric-owned NBC looks like a dim bulb since losing a Perot-sized fortune on the Summer Olympics, while scrappy ABC is now the most profitable of the bunch.

And then there's Fox. For the most part an unabashed purveyor of sleaze, the fourth network occasionally distinguishes itself with programming that's good by any standard, and the impulse to wholesale condemnation is frustrated.

Yet it doesn't make much sense to find *Roc* alongside *Vinnie and Bobby*, a comedy entertainment chief Peter Chernin has publicly admitted he was ashamed to air *Roc*, with a Yale-trained cast plucked from a Tony-winning Broadway play, has more than enough on-camera talent to tell the story of a Baltimore sanitation worker, his working wife, shiftless brother and retired dad.

After just half a season, star Charles Dutton sounded restless. "I wish we were doing *King Lear* every week," he said in January. The *adrenalin* began flowing again the following month when *Roc* aired live during the first week of the February sweeps. That theatrical turn evidently pleased both network

and viewers, and Fox is credited with the idea of an entire season of live performances beginning Sunday, Aug. 16.

"When I thought about it," Dutton says now, "it thrilled me and juiced me up because it was an opportunity to make television history (that) hasn't been done since 1955."

That's how long it's been since a prime-time drama or comedy series aired live each week. Most Fox viewers, who are commercial television's youngest, weren't even born then, and the rest probably didn't have a TV set. For the next 22 weeks, *Roc* will be performed live at 5:30 in Los Angeles so that it can air at 8:30 in living rooms on the East Coast.

"I think what will happen," Dutton predicts, "is that after two or three weeks, it'll smooth out. It'll be what we do — what this cast does. And it will be the same as if we were working on a stage play."

In fact, a live broadcast has one complication a stage show lacks: the necessity to perform each show in exactly 30 minutes, with time out for commercials. Executive producers Vic Kaplan and Jeff Abugov will cope by clocking rehearsals and having a couple of filler announcements on hand, as well as a short version of the show's closing credits.

Meanwhile audiences will be kept on their toes by the possibility of a flub — or outright disaster — inherent in the live format.

It's a challenge Dutton obviously craves, and when it comes to his feelings about working in traditional television, he doesn't mince words.

"When I say there's no challenge (in taping a series), I mean you can stay there till four in the morning, shooting that stuff. You don't have to learn your lines.

"I'm more than sure that we had one of the sweetest (taping) schedules in Hollywood. We started at 7:30, and we were finished by quarter after nine. In my opinion, 22 minutes of television doesn't deserve any more than that, if you have a conscientious cast, and a profession cast.

"You go through life wanting challenges, and I certainly do, and that just wasn't challenging enough. It wasn't fulfilling enough."

Dutton expects the behind-the-scenes staff to have the most challenging job.

"It's going to be on the production staff and the writers because we can't afford to crank out a script and then say, 'Oh, this script doesn't work, so let's just take a day off to make it — you guys go shopping, and then we'll work on the script.'"

"The writing staff will have the hardest task in cranking out, at least, shootable scripts from day one. And from that point on, hopefully, the scripts will get better."

"And I think next year, this time, we'll say, 'Aw, man, live is no problem.'"

"Who knew?" I thought that was great acting.

But he learned, thanks to a scholarship to Boston University, and his range broadened to include singing and dancing, which led to a 1989 Tony Award for his performance in *Jerome Robbins' Broadway*.

Of *Seinfeld*, Alexander says, "From the moment I saw the script, I thought it would be the most brilliant thing I'd ever be part of, and that it would not run for even a day, because I thought, 'The audience for this show is me, and I don't watch TV.'"

Q: Back in 1986 or 1987, there was a TV movie on NBC titled *A Time to Live*. It starred Liza Minnelli, and her dying son was played by Corey Haim. I am an avid fan of Corey's and wanted to know if it was possible to rent or see this film on cable. Also, if you have an address for him it would be appreciated. —Faith Lee, Erwin, N.C.

A: Actually made in 1985, *A Time to Live* marked Minnelli's TV-movie debut in an emotionally rewarding performance as a mother trying to care for her son (Haim), who is stricken with muscular dystrophy. The movie is available on video, and if you have no luck with local stores, try the Video Library of Philadelphia at 1-800-669-7157. Q: In the movie *The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance*, who played the part of Liberty Valance? I believe the same actor was in *Donovan's Reef* opposite Dorothy Lamour. —Irene Shaw, Adams, Mass.

A: Lee Marvin played the title role of a Western town bully who gets his from forthright young lawyer James Stewart and macho rancher John Wayne. Both Marvin and Wayne starred in *Donovan's Reef* alongside Lamour.

Q: I am very curious to know whether Shannen Doherty, who plays Brenda Walsh on Beverly Hills, 90210, was ever on *Little House on the Prairie*. Watching the reruns of that show, I'm almost positive that Shannen was on a few episodes. —Lois Johnson, Red Wing, Minn.

A: At age 11, Doherty indeed appeared on a number of episodes of *Little House on the Prairie*. A *New Beginning*, which originally ran only a single season from 1982-83. Her first TV job was in two-part episodes of *Father Murphy* alongside Merlin Olson, a longtime sidekick of Michael Landon's on the original *Little House*, which probably had something to do with her brief stint as Jenny Wilder on *A New Beginning*. Many may have gotten their first glimpse of Doherty opposite Christian Slater in the wickedly hilarious 1989 film *Heathers*.

Q: Bobby Darin and Sandra Dee

A: The name of the movie is *If a Man Answers*, released in 1962, two years after Darin and Dee were married in real life. The marriage ended in divorce in 1967.

Dee probably was not ready for all the demands placed upon young teen idols; she modeled in grade school and made her film debut before she was 15. Her private life away from films became an unhappy mess, and only recently on the talk-show circuit has she declared she is free of her past indiscretions.

Q: I watched the movie *You'll Like My Mother on TV* this weekend and would like to know where it was filmed. Patty Duke was one of the stars, but who else starred with her? —Mrs. Harry Timm, Goodhue, Minn.

A: If you're wondering if this tale of psychological suspense was filmed in your home state of Minnesota, your guess is right, though *Variety's* archives don't specify exactly where. In reading the original 1972 review, I noticed the trade mag had nothing but raves for Duke's performance, as well as for co-star Rosemary Murphy, as Duke's deranged mother-in-law. Sian Barbara Allen and Richard Thomas, in an uncharacteristically evil role as a rapist, also lend fine support.

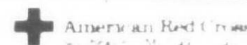

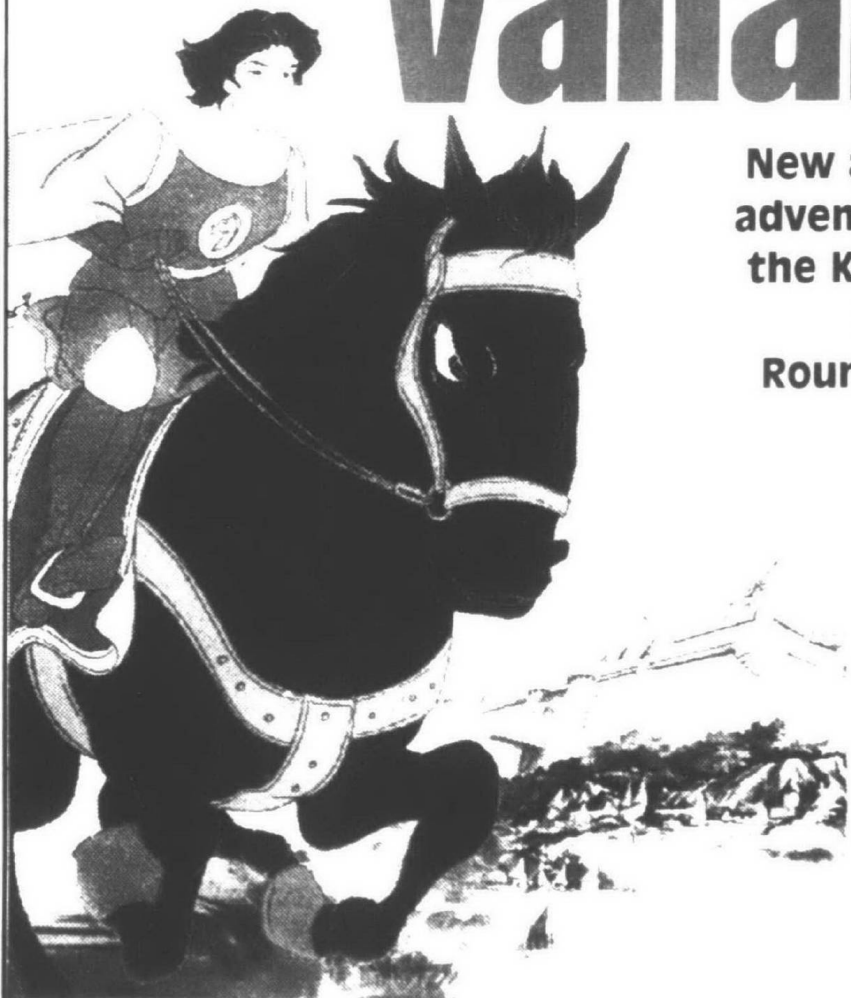
